AGENCIES COLOMBO On the person has been killed and two others injured in Sri Lanka's capital, Colombo, when the bodyguard of a Cabinet Minister under ousted Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe opened fire at a crowd of protesters. The shooting on Sunday came amid a constitutional crisis triggered by President Maithripala Sirisena's asching of the Prime Minister and his Cabinet. Ruwan Gunasekara, a police spokesperson, told reporters that a bodyguard for Arjuna Ranatunga, Wickremesinghe's Petroleum Minister, fired live rounds at a crowd of people loyal to

Minister, fired live rounds at a crowd of people loyal to Sirisena when they attempted to prevent the dismissed Minister from entering his office at the state-run Ceylon Petroleum Corporation. Meanwhile, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said India is "closely following" the recent political develop-ments in Sri Lanka. But the Indian civil services reform effort, since Independence, has been conservative, with limit-ed impact. The civil servants contin-ue to believe that their author-ire is deviced from corrupt of

ue to believe that their author-ity is derived from corpus of rules and regulations rather than from the mandate of peo-

ple. Transformative changes have taken place in United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and these changes have been brought about due to the belief that the civil services ought to be fully accountable to the citizens they serve and reflect their hopes and aspira-tions.

tions. Some improvement has come about due to incremental reform measures such as Organisation and Method (O & M), vigilance, citizens' griev-ance organisations, manpower

planning and Right To Information. But the one area information. But the one area which needs to be revisited is civil services recruitment and training. Recruitment to the civil services is through all India competitive examina-tion.

The Civil Services Examination was first con-ducted as an open competitive examination in the year 1855, in London. At that time, it was called the Indian Covenant Civil Service (ICCS) Examination and was con-ducted by the British Civil Services Commission. In 1926, the Public Service Commission (India) was et un which becan (India) was set up which began to conduct the Indian Civil to conduct the Indian Civil Service (ICS) Examination in India on behalf of the British Civil Services Commission. Under the Government of India Act 1935, Federal Public Service Commission was set

Service Commission was set up. After 1943, recruitment to the Indian Civil Service, the Indian Audit and Accounts Service and the allied services were suspended upto 1946. With the promulgation of the new Constitution for inde-pendent India on January 26, 1950, the Federal Public Service Commission was accorded

It is a grueling exam with three stages and it takes around one year to complete. The tenal marks obtained by the candidates in written and interview determine her overall rank of the candidate. Just should the marks obtained in a single exam determine ser-vice of a candidate, without testing his or her skill sets? It is obvious that the skill sets required by account and

finance service like the Indian Post and Telecom Accounts and Finance Service (IP&TAFS), Indian Defence Accounts Service (IDAS), Indian Civil Accounts Service

entrants join after selection into civil services. This issue could be addressed if the eval-uation was made after the three years course for selected candidates as recommended by Kothari Committee. Three months would be too short to make an assessment. There could be a separate sequence of the second services like finance and accounts ser-rices-IP&TAFS, IDAS, ICAS, IRAS etc. The civil service has to be representative in character and it needs to have a good num-ber from rural areas and dis-davantaged backgrounds. At present, the eligibility for the civil services exam is gradua-tion. As per US-India Policy Institute report of 2014 titled "Intergenerational and region-d differentials in higher edu-cation in India", the access to education beyond higher sec-ondary schooling is a mere 10 per cent among the university-ge population of India. Hence, where is a justification to con-side post-school recruitment to be followed by a tailor made three years training for select-el candidates and allorment of thervices and the secondary technoling is services based on post-training test. Accounts Service (IDAS), Indian Civil Accounts Service (ICAS), Indian Railway Accounts Service (IRAS) would be different from those required for police or foreign service. Then, what should be selection process for the dif-ferent services? Aircraft cabins are pressurised because the air is very thin at the altitude planes fly. To prevent complications, the cabins of many aircraft are adjusted to near sea-level pressure, which makes breathing almost the same as at sea level. 



The UIDAI wrote to banks after it n after it received legal opinion on the matter, in the wake of a recent Supreme Court verdict that restricted the use of Aadhaar by private entities but cleared it for welfare schemes.

The UIDAI informed the ks that they can use dhaar authentication for encliceries of Government spidies and welfare schemes, Aadhaar authentication for beneficieries of Government subsidies and welfare schemes,

subsidies and welfare schemes, and listed various 'options' for the use of Aadhaar (such as Quick Response or QR code and offline Aadhaar) for other banking customers in the light of Supreme Court judgement in the Aadhaar case, said the official who did not wish to be

transfer of any subsidy or ben-efit to the bank account of the beneficary, as well as for facil-itating the withdrawal of money through Aadhaar based micro-ATM machines. This means Aadhaar enabled Payment System (AePS) and BHIMAadhaar Pay shall remain operative and bank can continue to maintain and provide these facilities so that Direct Benefit Transfer or DBT beneficiaries can with Direct Benefit transfer or DBT beneficiaries can with draw their money through the micro-ATMS, AePS, BHIM Aadhaar Pay. in the Aadhaar case, said the official who did not wish to be named. Physical Aadhaar card can be used for verification in an offline mode if produced vol-untarily, it clarified. When contacted UIDAI CEO, Ajay Bhushan Pandey told PTI, "There are viable and completely paperless and digital options available through digitally signed elec-tronic form of Aadhaar which allows identity to be verified online without pinging our server. And through such methods the services can be seamlessly and digitally offered by banks for non-DBT customers". He also con-firmed that UIDAI's views have been sent to banks but uIDAI has said that banks will be entitled to seek authenmicro-ATMs, AePS, BHIM Aadhaar Pay. In its circular to banks, the UIDAI said that for customers giving declaration that they want to receive entitled bene-fits or subsidies of welfare schemes funded from the Consolidated Fund of India in their account directly, banks can perform Aadhaar-based authentication using e-KYC for opening bank accounts too.

The rates are off their record high of 846 per litre for petrol and $\xi_{75.45}$ a litre for diesel touched on October 4. On that day, the government decided to cut excise duty on petrol and diesel by $\xi_{1.50}$ per litre each and asked state owned fuel retailers to subsidise by another ξ_1 a litre by reduc-ing their margins.

A heavily-armed white man, spewing anti-Semitic threats, stormed a prominent synagogue and massacred 11 worshippers in the US city of Pittsburgh, in the deadliest attack on Jews in the history of America.

The shooter, identified as 46-year-old Robert Bowers, armed with an assault rifle and three handguns, surren-dered after he was injured dur-ing an exchange of fire with the police at Tree of Life Congregation Synagogue at Squirell Hill in Pittsburgh, where a large number of peo-ple had gathered for a baby naming ceremony.

The charges include 11 The charges include 11 counts of obstruction of exer-cise of religious beliefs result-ing in death, and 11 counts of use of a firearm to commit murder during a crime of vio-lence. Bowers frequently wrote on the social network Gab, where he made a specific threat against J gws hours before allegedly conducting Saturday's attack.

ick. In the post, Bowers said t the Hebrew Immigrant that that the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society, a humanitarian aid nonprofit group that provides assistance to refugees, brought immigrants to the United States to do violence against others. "Screw your optics, I'm going in," he wrote.

Undergoing bariatric surgery to combat obesity can prevent women from developing womb cancer (also known as uterine or endometrial cancer), claims a 36 study. The study, led by University of Manchester, showed that women who had gastric sleeve

of Manchester, showed that women who had gastric sleve or bypass surgery for obesity found that precancerous tissue in their womh reverted to normal tissue when they tools weight. "For surger obese women, quick access to weight loss surgery has benefits beyond improving diabetes and risk of heart disease. It can also reduce womb cancer risk," said Erms Torobie, clinical seeino lecturer from Manchester. "Losing weight through dieling is also likely to be effective, but we know that it is very hard to do and the weight lost is often re-gained," she said. In the study, published in International Journal of Cancer, the team examined rearly 100 women with an arerage BMI over 50 — considered to be super obser— had biopsis taken from their wombs during gastric or bypass surgery.
