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Patnaik to probe SC 'fixer' claims

Panel to look into 'conspiracy against CJJ' charge only, not into sexual harassment allegation

The Supreme Court on Thursday ordered a probe headed by former SC judge Justice AK Patnaik into allegations made by advocate Utsav Bains that there is a "corporate" conspiracy to frame the Chief Justice of India (CJI) Ranjan Gogoi on charges of sexual misconduct.

A Bench of Justices Arun Misra, RF Nariman and Deepak Gupta also directed Delhi Police, CBI and Intelligence Bureau to cooperate with Justice Patnaik in the probe. On the completion of inquiry, Justice (Retd) Patnaik will file a report in a sealed cover before the court after which the matter will be heard again.

Justice Patnaik was earlier appointed by SC to probe the allegations against former CBI Director Alok Verma.

Anguished over "systematic attack" to malign the judiciary, the Supreme Court said that time has come to send a message to the country that the top court was "not vulnerable" and nobody can "remote control" it either by money or political power. The top court, warned that if such attempts were not stopped the institution "will die".

During the course of the hearing, advocate Utsav Bains, who made the claim about a conspiracy to frame Justice Gogoi, filed an additional affidavit in a sealed cover in the court in support of his claims.



The court - while examining an affidavit by lawyer Utsav Bains - noted that the allegations of "Bench fixing are so serious that it requires investigation".

SC also noted that the probe committee will not go into the issue of sexual harassment allegations against the CJI and the outcome of the Justice Patnaik probe will not affect the in-house inquiry.

Meanwhile, Justice NV Ramana, part of 3-member in-house inquiry panel set up to examine the allegations of sexual harassment against Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi, recused himself from it on Thursday.

The development comes a day after the former apex court woman employee, who levelled the allegations against the CJI, wrote a letter to the panel expressing reservation over the inclusion of Justice Ramana.

Observing that the apex court cannot be run by money or political power, a three-judge special Bench headed by Justice Arun Mishra said that the day has come for them to rise and tell the country's rich and powerful that they are "playing with fire".

"Do not think that the Supreme Court can be remote controlled by anything on the earth, whether money power or

political power," the Bench said. "We are anguished with the way this institution is being treated in the last three-four years and we must say that it will die and it will not survive if this will happen. There is systematic attack, systematic game to malign this great institution," the court said.

The Bench said letters were being written and books were being printed in matters pending in the court and this practice has to be stopped.

"Do the rich and powerful of this country think that they can remote control the Supreme Court," the Bench said.

The hard hitting observations by the Bench came after Solicitor General Tushar Mehta said there should be a probe by a special investigation team (SIT) on the allegations levelled by advocate Utsav Singh Bains in his affidavit as he has

claimed a larger conspiracy which concerns the administration of justice.

"You (Mehta) are provoking us to speak. We are not inclined to say but now listen. So many things are going on. There are serious allegations that need to be probed. The Supreme Court cannot be run by money power or political power," Justice Mishra said.

"It is an institution of you people and not ours. Judges come and go but if these things will happen then it (institution) will die and it will not survive," the Bench said.

During the hearing on Thursday, the Bench said, "We cannot mention several things. People are trying to manage the court registry by money power. When somebody tries to improve things, he is killed and maligned? We have come to this extent of blackmailing."

Varanasi echoes with Modi during roadshow

Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a massive 7-km roadshow in Varanasi, touching all ancient ghats which have presence of different communities settled from across the country for centuries. Ahead of filing his nomination papers on Friday, the PM sought a second term for himself as party painted the ancient city saffron.

Modi commenced his roadshow by first garlanding the statue of Banaras Hindu University (BHU) founder Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya and then proceeded in an open vehicle with thousands of supporters lined-up on both sides

raining flower petals on him.

Clad in a saffron kurta, Modi, in a repeat of 2014 roadshow, greeted people with folded hands and incessant waving.

Modi's roadshow meandered through localities like Lanka, Assi Ghat, Sonarpur, Narad Ghat, Madanpura, Gadoliya and concluded at Dashaswamegh Ghat where he performed the famous Ganga Aarti amid sound of "Shankhs" and "Ghantis".

Madanpura is largely a Muslim populated part of the city where the Prime Minister passed through in the evening.

Modi, who will file his nomination papers on Friday at about 11.30 am in the presence

of NDA alliance partners, including Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, Shiv Sena chief Udhav Thackeray and former Punjab CM Prakash Singh Badal, was accompanied by UP CM Yogi Adityanath, Union Ministers Piyush Goyal, Sushma Swaraj, and JP Nadda during the roadshow.

Amid loud shouts of "Modi, Modi", the Prime Minister's cavalcade slowed-down at many places with the PM acknowledging people waving at him from rooftops.

Boats in the Ganga were lighted with Modi's cut-out and display of "Mai Bhi Chowkidar" and BJP's symbol lotus.

AAP manifesto promises full Statehood for national Capital

With full Statehood as the main poll plank, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Thursday launched its manifesto for general election. With the status, the Delhi Government "will have control over land, law and order, police and control over officials and decision-making," AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal said while launching the manifesto.

The manifesto covered a range of issues in 12 areas of education, health, women safety, police reforms, zero corruption, jobs, land and housing, protection from sealing, cleanliness, pollution, transport, and Yamuna rejuvenation.

It also explained how all the other national Capitals have power over local police, appointment and transfer of officials, land and city planning, housing, traffic and transport planning and control over local bodies while Delhi has none of it.

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Karkare's ex-colleague files nomination to fight Pragya

The already tough contest in the Bhopal parliamentary seat is likely more intense as a former subordinate of late Maharashtra ATS chief Hemant Karkare has filed his nomination as an independent candidate from the seat.

Claiming that he was hurt by BJP candidate Pragya Singh Thakur's remark against Hemant Karkare, a former colleague of the slain chief of Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad Riyazuddin Ghayasuddin Deshmukh (60), is in the poll fray from Bhopal.

Hailing from Aurangabad, Deshmukh told media persons here on Thursday that he was deeply hurt and devastated by Thakur's remark against his former boss.

Thakur, out on bail in the 2008 Malegaon blast case, had said that Karkare died in the 26/11 Mumbai terror attack because she had cursed him for torturing her during the blast probe. She withdrew the statement later.

"Seconds after she called

Karkare sahab anti-national, I decided to contest the election against her," said Deshmukh, who retired as Assistant Commissioner of Police in 2016.

"I had worked as a sub-inspector under Karkare when he was the Superintendent of Police in Akola. He was my boss. He was brave, co-operative, encouraging and a gem of a person. He liked me very much and I respected him immensely," he added.

Deshmukh said he filed his nomination on April 23. "I am not going to withdraw it at any cost," he said.

The 60-year-old cop has reported an income of Rs 5.60 lakh per annum as per his affidavit.

He has identified himself as a former government officer and earns a living through pension. He has specified his education as an MBA in HR which he had pursued in year 2014.

To add, the Marathi community which has sizable presence in Bhopal is already anguished against Thakur for allegedly maligning the image of a brave officer. The community has protested in the city against Thakur once and another protest is also scheduled in Bhopal on Thursday.

Maruti to pull plug on diesel cars from April next year

Country's largest carmaker Maruti Suzuki India (MSI) on Thursday announced that it will stop sales of all diesel-engined cars from April 1, 2020. This is the day that Bharat Stage 6 (BS6) emission norms come into force in India and no old Bharat Stage 4 diesel engine vehicles will be allowed to be registered.

"The Supreme Court has made it clear that it will not allow the sale and registration of any BS4 from April 1, 2020," MSI chairman RC Bhargava said explaining the decision.

Some of the company's models like Vitara Brezza and S-Cross currently come with a diesel engine option only.

During the carmakers annual results conference on Thursday, Bhargava said making existing diesel engines BS6 compatible was not technically possible and also the cost of a BS6 diesel option on smaller cars would add at least ₹1 lakh to the existing cost of a diesel car.

Cong ends suspense around Priyanka, picks Ajay Rai against Modi

Congress on Thursday fielded old-hand Ajay Rai from Varanasi to take on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, ending speculation of a possible electoral duel between Priyanka Gandhi Vadra and the PM.

The suspense finally ended with the party nominating Rai, who unsuccessfully contested against Modi in 2014 and finished third after the BJP leader and AAP's Arvind Kejriwal. In 2014, Modi won by a margin of over three lakh votes against Aam Aadmi Party leader Arvind Kejriwal. While Modi got over 5,81,000 votes, Rai managed about 75,000 votes.

The party also fielded Madhusudan Tiwari from Gorakhpur against BJP's Ravi Kishan, a popular Bhojpur



film star.

Speculation on Priyanka making her electoral debut from Varanasi had been rife for the past few weeks and was fuelled after Congress president Rahul Gandhi, to a question on whether he planned to field his sister against PM Modi, said last week, "I will leave you in suspense. Suspense is not always a bad thing."

With an aim to create awareness against wildlife crime, WWF - TRAFFIC (India) has put on display Snow Leopard Panthera uncia, Greater One-Horned Rhino Rhinoceros unicornis; pangolins; Asian Elephant Elephas maximus; and Don't Buy Trouble (which lists prohibited wildlife species for possession or trade in India) at the Customs checkpoint in Terminal 3 of Indira Gandhi International airport (IGIA) in Delhi.

Ravi Singh, Secretary General and CEO of WWF-India, said, "Lack of awareness is one of the biggest hurdles in efforts to curtail wildlife trafficking in the air transport sector. These displays will help raise awareness and sensitise both travelers and airport staff about wildlife trafficking."

To educate air travelers on



wildlife crime -poaching and illegal trade, The Indian Customs Department; TRAF-

FIC and WWF-India are reaching out to travelers passing through IGIA which is con-

sidered the busiest airport in the world.

Dr Amandeep Singh, Additional Commissioner, Office of the Commissioner of Customs, IGI Airport, Terminal-3, Delhi, said, "Illegal wildlife trade has grown to become a very serious crime globally. Here at customs, we recognise this threat to our country's biodiversity and have therefore undertaken this awareness initiative to help enlighten travelers as well as customs officials about the species impacted by illegal wildlife trade. Customs is fully behind the efforts to control wildlife crime in the country."

At a time, when consumer demand for wildlife products is a leading threat facing many wildlife species traffickers rely on existing transport links to smuggle illegal wildlife products to consumers across the world.

LS polls: 148 candidates declared valid after scrutiny

Total 148 candidates have been declared valid after the scrutiny out of the total 169 candidates, who had filed their nominations for Lok Sabha election-2019 for eight parliamentary constituencies to be held under the third phase (sixth phase of the country) of the state.

The parliamentary constituencies namely Morena, Bhind (SC), Gwalior, Guna, Sagar, Vidisha, Bhopal and Rajgarh are included under this phase. The last date for withdrawal of name and voting has been fixed as April 26 and May 12 respectively.

After the scrutiny, 25 candidates in Morena, 18 in Bhind (SC), 19 in Gwalior, 11 in Guna, 12 in Sagar 15 in Vidisha, 35 in Bhopal and 13 candidates in Rajgarh parliamentary constituency are left in poll fray.

For the election under the third phase, 27 nominations in

The parliamentary constituencies namely Morena, Bhind (SC), Gwalior, Guna, Sagar, Vidisha, Bhopal and Rajgarh are included under this phase. The last date for withdrawal of name and voting has been fixed as April 26 and May 12 respectively

Morena, 22 in Bhind (SC), 27 in Gwalior, 11 in Guna, 13 in Sagar, 16 in Vidisha, 39 in Bhopal and 13 in Rajgarh parliamentary constituency were filed till Tuesday April 23.

Under the fourth phase in the state (7th phase of Country) for the Lok Sabha Election-2019, 32 nominations have been received from 27 candidates. Eight parliamentary constituencies namely Dewas (SC),

Ujjain (SC), Mandsaur, Ratlam (ST), Dhar (ST), Indore, Khargone (ST) and Khandwa are included in this phase.

Total two nominations from two candidates in Parliamentary Constituency Dewas (SC), 4 from 3 candidates in Ujjain (SC), 5 from 4 in Mandsaur, 5 from 3 in Ratlam (ST), 3 from 2 in Dhar (ST), 5 from 5 candidates in Indore and Khargone (ST) each and 3 from 3 candidates in Khandwa have been received after the notification publication date for the election under the fourth phase ie April 22 till date.

Based on the complaint, after the preliminary investigation, the police have registered a case under section 376 of the IPC and section of POCSO Act.

Police team searched for the accused and nabbed him. The details of the accused would be investigated. He holds crime record. During the investigation police have not found any crime record of the accused.

The victim is a class 10 student and after the incident she used to remain depressed but never shared the incident and when the accused tried to force her to have relationship with her she braved to report the incident.

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SP has turned Azamgarh into stronghold of terrorism: Yogi

Azamgarh (UP): Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Thursday alleged that the Samajwadi Party had turned Azamgarh, which was once known in the field of education and literature, into a "stronghold of terrorism".

The Samajwadi Party (SP) and the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) have crime in their DNA, he said, while addressing an election meeting here in support of BJP's Azamgarh Lok Sabha seat candidate Dinesh Lal Yadav 'Nirahua'.

"Once Azamgarh was known in the field of education and literature but the Samajwadi Party turned it into a stronghold of terrorism," he said.

The SP and the BSP through mischievous means made Azamgarh "a fortress of terror and crime to defame it and we have come to pull it out of it," the chief minister said.

They have crime in their DNA and "that is why they support cases like the Batla House (encounter case)," he said. "We must link Azamgarh to art and culture and not with terrorism and crime," said Adityanath, who was barred from campaigning for 72 hours by the Election Commission for his 'Ali-Bajrang Bali' remark.

He said when he was attacked here, people stood by him.

On September 7, 2008, one person was killed and six others were injured in an attack here on the convoy of Adityanath, who was then a BJP MP.

The incident took place when he was going to address a rally.

"We are trying to link Azamgarh with capital Lucknow through the Purvanchal Expressway so that an atmosphere conducive to business is created here," he said at Thursday's rally.

The chief minister said a decision has been taken to set up an university here to encourage education.

Referring to the first three phases of polling, he claimed that the BJP is going to form government with a massive majority. Everyone wants Narendra Modi to be prime minister once again, Adityanath said.

In 2014, the party had won 73 of 80 seats in Uttar Pradesh while this time the target has been fixed to win 74 seats and the 74th seat is Azamgarh, he said. **PTI**

BJP's Muslim face in Bhopal won't campaign for Pragya Thakur

Bhopal: Fatima Rasool Siddique, the BJP's lone Muslim candidate in the last year's Madhya Pradesh Assembly polls, on Thursday announced she will not campaign for Sadhvi Pragya Singh Thakur, the saffron party's Lok Sabha nominee from Bhopal.

Siddique, who unsuccessfully contested Assembly polls from the Bhopal North seat in November last year, said some of the statements given by Thakur, an accused in the Malegaon bomb blast case of 2008, after her candidature was announced were "communal and obnoxious".

"I won't campaign for her as she has made statements like waging a 'dharma yudh' (crusade). Her controversial statement against former Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) chief Hemant Karkare, a martyr who laid down his life fighting terrorists in the 26/11 attacks in Mumbai, has also hurt me badly," the 35-year-old told PTI.

"Pragya's statements about dharm yudh and against Karkare have not gone down well in my community also," she said.

Siddique said the 49-year-old right-wing activist's remarks have also tarnished the image of BJP leader and former Madhya Pradesh Chief

Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan.

"Her statements have damaged the image of Shivraj Singh Chouhan, who has good connect with Muslims," said the daughter of Rasool Ahmed Siddique, a Congress leader and former Cabinet Minister in the State. **PTI**

Karkare's ex-colleague contesting against Sadhvi

Bhopal: Saying he was hurt by BJP candidate Pragya Singh Thakur's remark against Hemant Karkare, a former colleague of the slain chief of Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad is contesting the election against her from Bhopal Lok Sabha constituency.

Riyazuddin Ghayasuddin Deshmukh (60), who had worked under Karkare, has filed nomination as independent candidate.

Deshmukh, who is from Aurangabad, told PTI Thursday that he was "deeply hurt and devastated" by Thakur's remark against his former boss.

Thakur, out on bail in the 2008 Malegaon blast case, had said that Karkare died in the 26/11 Mumbai terror attack because she had "cursed" him for "torturing" her during the blast probe.

She withdrew the statement later. **PTI**

Indian Govt pressurising Interpol for red corner notice: Zakir Naik

Mumbai: Controversial Islamic preacher Zakir Naik on Thursday accused the Indian Government of engaging in a "witch-hunt" and putting pressure on the Interpol to issue a red corner notice against him.

In a statement issued here, Naik, who fled India in 2016, said he was aware of the "pressure the Indian government was applying on the Interpol" to issue a red corner notice against him.

"It's part of an elaborate witch-hunt. But having verified with a few member countries, I can confirm that there is no red corner notice against me as of date," he claimed.

"One of the Indian newspapers seems to have jumped the gun and reported internal deliberations of the Indian government which, as a matter of fact, have been going on for over two years now," he said.

Naik said the Interpol had already cancelled a red corner notice against him once.

"And it's been one-and-a-

half years since the government submitted a charge sheet and started applying pressure on the Interpol. But as things stand, I have no reason to believe that Interpol will succumb to any kind of undue pressure," he said.

Naik, said to be in Malaysia at present, has been under investigation since 2016, when the Centre banned his Islamic Research Foundation (IRF) for five years.

He is being probed by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) on several charges under the Indian Penal Code and the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA).

The preacher, declared a proclaimed offender by a special NIA court here in June 2017, is accused of inciting youth to take up terror activities, giving hate speeches and promoting enmity between communities.

The NIA filed a charge sheet against Naik and others before a Mumbai court in October 2017. **PTI**

Court seeks reply on steps taken to trace those missing in Kedarnath tragedy

Nainital: The Uttarakhand High Court has sought a reply from the State Government within a month on steps taken to trace those who went missing in the 2013 Kedarnath tragedy.

Hearing a PIL on Wednesday, Chief Justice Ramesh Ranganathan and Justice Narayan Singh Dhanik directed the Government to file a reply within four weeks listing steps taken by the Govt to determine whereabouts of those who went missing after the deluge. The Court admitted the PIL for final hearing on Wednesday and directed the state government to file an affidavit detailing steps taken to retrieve the persons or bodies of persons missing since the tragedy.

Filed by Delhi resident Ajay Gautam, the PIL had demanded constitution of a special committee to look into whereabouts of disaster victims who continued to be missing more than six years after the tragedy. It was contended in the PIL that in the 2013 Kedarnath tragedy about 4,200 people went missing while Government statistics show 3,322 missing people. Even then only 600 skeletons have been found till date. **PTI**

Parrikar's son among 2 shortlisted by BJP for Panaji bypoll

Panaji: Utpal Parrikar, the elder son of late Goa chief minister Manohar Parrikar, is one of the two persons shortlisted by the BJP to contest the upcoming bypoll in the Panaji Assembly seat, a party leader said on Thursday.

Goa BJP president Vinay Tendulkar on Wednesday held discussions with various party units, including the Panaji block committee, to discuss the names

of probables, he said.

"Two names have been shortlisted, one is Utpal Parrikar and the other is Siddharth Kunkoliencar," the senior BJP leader said on condition of anonymity.

Both the names would be sent to the party's parliamentary board in New Delhi for a final decision, he added.

The Panaji Assembly bypoll, scheduled on May 19,

was necessitated following the death of sitting BJP MLA and the then chief minister Manohar Parrikar last month.

Utpal Parrikar, 38, who has done a Masters degree course from the US and is presently into business, earlier said he would be ready to take any responsibility given to him by the BJP.

Kunkoliencar first won the Panaji seat during the 2015 by-

election.

He again bagged the seat in the 2017 state Assembly polls, but vacated it later that year to make way for Manohar Parrikar to be inducted into the House.

The opposition Congress has already announced former state minister Atanasio Monserrate as its candidate for the Panaji Assembly seat, which comprises around 22,000 voters. **PTI**

Manhunt launched to nab absconding BJP candidate in Odisha

Bhubaneswar: A manhunt has been launched to nab Om Prakash Mishra, the BJP candidate for Satyabadi assembly constituency, who along with his supporters allegedly destroyed EVMs and tore poll documents in a booth during the third phase of polling in Odisha on April 23, police said.

"The BJP candidate is absconding since then," Puri Superintendent of Police, Umashankar Dash, told reporters. **PTI**

Three police teams have raided Mishra's residence at Hansapal in Bhubaneswar but could not find him, the SP said.

The police action came on the basis of a complaint lodged by the Presiding Officer, Shivaram Mohapatra.

Mishra and his supporters allegedly entered a polling booth at Birakishorepur village under Kanas block on April 23 and vandalised the EVMs, the presiding officer said in the complaint. **PTI**

IT raids in Srinagar, ex-Min denies being searched

Srinagar: Income Tax (IT) officials carried out raids at various places in the city on Thursday but former Jammu and Kashmir Minister Imran Raza Ansari denied that any of his properties were searched, sources said.

The I-T officials carried out raids at North Point Towers, a commercial complex in Karan Nagar area housing several commercial offices.

Similar raids were also carried out in Alamgari

Bazaar area in the old city area, the sources added.

There has, however, been no official word so far from the I-T Department as to what led to the raids in Srinagar or whether any incriminating evidence was recovered.

Sources close to Ansari, a senior leader of the Peoples Conference, denied that any raids had been carried out at Ansari's properties and dismissed such reports as "rumours". **PTI**

Arsenal storage tunnels to secure regions along China

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

In an effort to boost its defences in the region facing China on the Line of Actual Control (LAC), the Army in collaboration with the public sector National Hydroelectric Power Corporation (NHPC) will build tunnels or concrete caverns to store ammunition.

Huge bunkers will ensure that the ammunition cannot be destroyed by artillery fire or aerial bombing besides ensuring smooth supply of bombs and bullets to the troops without any hindrance.

The pilot project costing about ₹15 crore for four tunnels has to be completed within two years after the Army and the NHPC signed a MOU here on Thursday. Three of the four tunnels will be built in Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh facing China while the fourth will come up in the mountain region of Jammu division.

Each ammunition bunker has the capacity to store more than 200 metric tonnes of ammunition and will also be safe from the vagaries of weather including ammunition getting damaged due to dampness.

Explaining the significance of the project, officials said China already has built similar storage tunnels in the Tibet region. While India also has similar underground caverns in the plain regions of the country, this pilot project, if successful, will pave the way for constructing similar tunnels in the inaccessible mountain regions facing China, they said.

"Misuse of the aviation system by smugglers to evade customs and other enforcement agencies is a major concern. Meanwhile, both international and domestic airline passengers are sometimes unaware about the illegality of buying certain wildlife products and the grave conservation impact of their actions on various species in the wild," said a WWF official.

Manish Kumar, IRS, Commissioner of Customs, IGI Airport, said, "Stamping out wildlife crime and smuggling is a high priority objective for Indian Customs. At the IGI Airport, we are constantly on alert against any attempts to smuggle wildlife contrabands. We appreciate the efforts undertaken by TRAFFIC and WWF-India for engaging in initiatives that will help to curtail smuggling of wildlife products and derivatives."

Dr Saket Badola, Head of TRAFFIC's India office, said, "This is the first time TRAFFIC has partnered with Customs at Delhi's IGI airport and we hope this partnership can be extended to other airports in the country."

Pragya used to carry knife, stabbed a man: Chhattisgarh CM

Jabalpur (MP): Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Thursday claimed that Malegaon blast accused and BJP candidate from Bhopal Lok Sabha seat Pragya Singh Thakur stabbed a man in 2001.

Thakur's conduct did not become of a 'Sadhvi' (ascetic or holy woman), the Congress leader said, speaking at a press conference here.

"Pragya Thakur has a connection with our Chhattisgarh. Her brother-in-law worked at a warehouse in Bilaiagarh (in Balodabazar district)," Baghel said, when asked whether the BJP was playing the 'Hindutva card' by fielding her.

"She used to carry a knife and stabbed a young man named Shailendra Devagan in the chest with a knife in Bilaiagarh in 2001," Baghel said.

"Pragya also used to indulge in fights, and from the beginning her conduct was like that of a habitual criminal and not like that of a Sadhvi," the chief minister said. Thakur is currently out on bail. Rubbishing Baghel's claims, a BJP spokesperson said the Chhattisgarh CM should "talk sense".

"Baghel ji should talk sense and refrain from making any statement sans proof. He should apologise for his outlandish remarks against Sadhvi ji or be ready to face a defamation suit from us," Madhya Pradesh BJP spokesperson Hitesh Bajpai said.

Six people were killed and over 100 injured in a bomb blast at Malegaon, a communally sensitive textile town in north Maharashtra's Nashik district, on September 29, 2008.

The Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad arrested Thakur and others in the case, alleging they were part of a Hindu extremist group which carried out the blast. **PTI**

Tur dal worth ₹29 lakh found adulterated; probe ordered

At pr 25 (PTI) Tur dal worth Rs 29 lakh has been found adulterated during an inspection at a warehouse in Gujarat's Junagadh district, prompting the state government to order a probe Thursday, said officials. An FIR has been registered against seven persons in connection with the incident, they said.

This tur dal stock was procured by Gujarat State Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd from the farmers of Junagadh on behalf of central government entity National Agriculture Co-operative Marketing Federation of India (NAFED), said Managing Director of GSC-SCL, Manish Bhardwaj.

While the government claimed the guilty will be brought to justice, Congress leaders alleged it was an "insiders job" and people sitting at "high places" were involved in it.

The irregularity came to light two days ago when adulterated tur dal was found in 3,241 gunny bags of 50 kg each at a warehouse in Pithadia village of Junagadh district.

"That stock was procured by us in January at APMC market of Keshod town in Junagadh. During our inspection at the warehouse, sub-standard tur dal was found mixed with good quality tur dal in 3,241 bags.

"The stock was worth Rs 29 lakh. We then sent those bags back to Keshod APMC and launched our probe," said Bhardwaj.

Meanwhile, Gujarat Civil Supplies Minister Jayesh Radadia said an FIR against seven persons, who were allegedly behind the adulteration during tur dal procurement, has been registered in Keshod.

"Our MD Manish Bhardwaj was in Keshod today to conduct an inquiry. I want to say that tur dal procurement was conducted in transparent manner."

"Thus, we want to probe how such thing has happened and who were behind it. We will not spare any one found guilty," warned Radadia.

According to Bhardwaj, some persons behind this alleged scam have been already identified.

US agencies to visit India to unravel Thowheed

The US State Department and a host of officials from American covert agencies are set to make a beeline to India to get first-hand account and perspectives on the National Thowheed Jamat (NTJ) that executed the deadliest attack in the region in the last one decade by hitting luxury hotels and churches in Sri Lanka on Sunday.

The move comes as the US State Department was caught unaware despite the NTJ twitter handle following at least six officials of the US State department officials but could not get an assessment on the outfit's nefarious agenda even as India provided actionable inputs to Colombo two weeks before the bombings. The NTJ handle followed a total of 28 handles.

Interestingly, the security architecture of the servers of NTJ's online services is also based in the US which also hosts the servers of Pakistan-based terror groups Jaish-e-Mohammad and Lashkar-e-Tayyaba as also the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR).

No travel advisory to Indians in Lanka by Doval's NSCC

New Delhi: While India provided actionable inputs to the Sri Lankan Government days ahead of the serial suicide bombings in capital Colombo, the National Security Council Secretariat headed by the National Security Advisor Ajit Doval did not bother to ensure issuance of a travel advisory to Indians against visiting luxury hotels and churches in the island nation. Had the travel advisory been issued in time, the precious lives of about a dozen Indians killed in the attacks could have been saved. The failure has been brushed under the carpet and even an enquiry has not been ordered till far for the lapse. **PNS**

According to the inputs provided by India over two weeks before the serial suicide bombings, the NTJ was planning to target five-star hotels and churches following which the Sri Lankan police issued an alert to various police units but could not prevent the attacks.

As per the inputs with the Indian agencies, the NTJ had first tried to hit the Indian embassy in Colombo on April 4 but after finding the security tight enough, the outfit tried to target the US embassy on April 11 but to no avail. Following the failures, the NTJ decided to target the luxury hotels and the churches on April 21.

Post-26/11 Mumbai terror attacks, the who's who of American intelligence and investigation agencies had travelled to Mumbai to question Mohammad Ajmal Kasab, the lone terrorist nabbed in the case.

However, the NIA team had returned empty-handed from the US that had visited the US in 2009 to quiz David Coleman Headley, one of the conspirators of the Mumbai terror attacks.

The NTJ clearly posed itself as an anti-democracy organization and posted radical religious posts on its Twitter handle with a follower base of around 3,000 people.

ARMY STARTS PROCESS TO INDUCT WOMEN AS JAWANS

New Delhi: In the first step of its kind, the Army on Thursday began the process to induct women as jawans or soldiers in the military police, nearly two years after Army Chief Gen. Bipin Rawat said women will be recruited as jawans. The Army started the online registration for recruitment in the Corps of military and the last date for filing application has been fixed as June 8.

RAPE CASE: SAD SEEKS EC'S INTERVENTION

New Delhi: The Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) on Thursday urged the Election Commission (EC) to direct the Punjab Police to take prompt action against a school board member accused of raping a minor girl. In a complaint submitted to the EC, the SAD urged the poll panel to get the issue probed by a senior police officer keeping in view the seriousness of the charges. New Delhi: Having been banned by the EC from holding public rallies for 48 hours over his derogatory remarks against Congress president Rahul Gandhi, Himachal Pradesh BJP chief Satpal Satti has been issued another notice by the poll body on why action should not be taken against him for making "derogatory" and "inciting" remarks against his political opponents.

SC DIRECTS EC TO ACT ON COMPLAINT OF TMC

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Thursday directed the Election Commission to take action on a complaint by TMC candidate Mahua Moitra against BJP leader Mahadev Sarkar for allegedly making sexually coloured remarks. A bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi directed the EC to pass a reasoned order forthwith.

SC IRKED OVER ASSAM'S RESPONSE ON FOREIGNERS

New Delhi: The Supreme Court got irked on Thursday over unsatisfactory response of the Assam Government on deportation and conditional release of illegal foreigners and cautioned the State's Chief Secretary, saying that it would issue a contempt notice against him.

Bumper foodgrain output expected this kharif season

With the Indian Meteorological Department forecasting "near normal" monsoon this year, the Agriculture Ministry on Thursday set its target for foodgrain production during kharif season 2019-20 at 147.9 million tonnes (MT), with rice output pegged at 102 MT. These targets are higher when compared to the actual kharif output for 2018-19, which is 142.24 MT, as per the second advance estimates.

The Ministry also expects the production during the 2019-20 rabi season to be tentatively around 143.2 MT. At the National Conference on Agriculture, officials said rice production would touch the 102 MT-mark this kharif season, while maize production would be around 21.3 MT. The production of bumper foodgrain output expected this kharif season, cereals will be about 35.8 MT, while that of pulses would be around 10.1 MT. The output of jowar, bajra and ragi will be 2.1 MT, 9.5 MT and 2.3 MT, respectively. Also, total oil seeds production is likely to be 25.84 MT and the sugarcane output is expected to be 385.50 MT, the Ministry said. Cotton output is estimated to be 35.75 million bales (each of 170 kg).

OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY DISCUSSED 3-day Navy commanders' meet ends

As tension prevails between India and Pakistan post Pulwama attack and the three Armed Forces are now on full alert to meet any situation, functional reorganisation of Indian Navy towards improving operational efficiency formed the core of discussions during the three-day Navy commanders' conference which ended here on Thursday.

The conference assumed greater significance in the backdrop of Pulwama-associated events that have brought country's defence under sharper focus and provided the higher naval leadership a forum to discuss the emerging challenges in the maritime domain and fine tune the strategies for responding to the evolving geo-strategic environment, officials said here.

Forty Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel were killed on February 14 in Pulwama in a suicide attack. The IAF carried out air strikes on Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) training camp in Balakot, Pakistan on February 26. Pakistan retaliated the next day and tried to conduct air strikes against military installations of India in Rajouri sector.

Inaugurating the conclave, Defence Minister Nirmala Sitharaman complimented the Indian Navy for maintaining a



high operational tempo and its ability to not only safeguard India's interest in the maritime domain but also coerce an adversary into submission as was evident during the recent standoff.

During the interaction, the Defence Minister reviewed the combat readiness, pace of modernisation and progress of various acquisition and infrastructure related cases. While praising the Indian Navy's foreign cooperation efforts to support the Navies in the region, she urged the Naval Commanders to optimally utilise available resources to

build a strong Navy that is ready and vigilant to counter any challenge that may emerge in the maritime domain.

Chairing the conference, Navy Chief Admiral Sunil Lanba addressed the Commanders on various important issues pertaining to operational readiness, capability enhancement, maintenance, op logistics, infrastructure development and human resource management.

Functional Reorganisation of Indian Navy towards improving Operational Efficiency and 'Optimal Manning'

formed the core of discussions towards finalising the long term road map of the Navy.

In keeping with the Navy's ethos of harnessing niche technologies, concrete plans to incorporate 'Big Data Analytics' and 'Artificial Intelligence' for solutions in the domains of naval combat, convergence of networks, information, logistics, administration and equipment health monitoring for sustained operation were also discussed.

The next edition of Naval Commanders' Conference is scheduled in October or November this year.

Forces Tribunal directs Govt to reply in 3 weeks regarding Vice-Admiral's plea

Two days after Vice Admiral Bimal Verma approached the Armed Forces Tribunal again challenging the selection of his junior Karambir Singh as the next Navy chief, the Tribunal on Thursday directed the Central Government to submit its response within three weeks. The new Navy chief takes over on May 31 after incumbent Admiral Sunil Lanba retires that day. Verma in his plea had sought a stay on the Government order on March 23 appointing Singh as the next Navy chief.

Verma, now heading the strategically important Andaman and Nicobar Command, had earlier withdrawn his plea on April 8 after the Tribunal asked him to first exhaust all other ways including seeking redress from the Navy through a statutory complaint. The officer, however, again appealed to the Tribunal on Tuesday. His daughter Rhea Verma and Ankur Chibber are representing Verma in the legal battle.

Incidentally, Verma, younger brother of former Navy Chief Nirmal Verma, had filed the statutory complaint on April 10. The petitioner retires in November. During the proceedings here on Thursday, the centre sought four weeks times regarding the appeal filed by Verma on April 23 and the

matter will now come up for hearing again on May 20, Verma's daughter Rhea said. She also said the central government has to positively decide on the complaint by May 15.

In the latest petition filed in the Tribunal on Tuesday, Verma had sought that the government order on March 23 to appoint Karambir Singh as the next Navy Chief instead of him be stayed.

The petition filed by his daughter Rhea Verma said "Call for confidential reports of the applicant and Vice Admiral Karambir... examine them to see whether any irrelevant and extraneous considerations were placed to reject applicant's case and if so, to expunge the extraneous considerations and direct the competent authority to re-examine the case," the plea said.

The plea said the Vice Admiral had filed a statutory complaint before the Defence Ministry for not being appointed the next Navy Chief despite being the senior most and asked it to decide the matter urgently within ten days. "The complaint is still pending with the competent authority and hence this original application (petition)," the plea said.

In a communication dated March 23, he had stated that the government has "illegally" and in a "wrongful" manner appointed his junior Karambir Singh as the next Navy chief.

Verma had stated that he felt that the respondents (government) had illegally and in a wrongful manner used the two letters of Severe Displeasure, which were issued to him in 2005 and 2007, to deny him the post of the Navy chief.

The two letters were issued to Verma on October 28, 2005, and June 20, 2007, and he was promoted to the rank of Commodore and Rear Admiral afterwards, thereby taking away the sting of the said letters.

Verma also said "it is imperative that the Armed Forces court apply the 'Wednesbury rule' and consider whether relevant facts are not considered and irrelevant facts were considered by the respondents before passing the impugned letter."

The Naval headquarters forwarded the name of Verma along with Vice Admiral Karambir Singh and Vice Admiral Ajit Kumar, the Flag Officer Commander-in-Chief Western Naval Command and Vice Admiral Anil Kumar Chawla, the Flag Officer Southern Naval Command, to head the Navy. Verma retires in November end.

It is the second time in the current NDA regime that the seniority tradition was overlooked. In the first case in 2016, Bipin Rawat was appointed the Army Chief superseding the senior most officer Lt General Pravin Bakshi.

Ex-Army chief appointed Indian envoy to Seychelles

New Delhi: Former Army chief Dalbir Singh Suhag has been appointed as India's next high commissioner to Seychelles, a country which is of strategic importance to India in the Indian Ocean region.

"He is expected to take up the assignment shortly," the Ministry of External Affairs said while making the announcement. General (retired) Suhag was the Army chief from July 31, 2014, to December 31, 2016. He was also part of the Indian Peace Keeping Force (IPKF) in Sri Lanka in 1987.

His appointment as Indian High Commissioner to Seychelles comes amid deepening military ties between India and the island nation.

India is developing Assumption Island in Seychelles as a naval base to expand its footprint in the strategically-key region where China has been trying to enhance its military presence. An agreement to develop the island was inked in 2015 between India and Seychelles.

In June last year, Seychelles President Danny Faure visited India during which both countries agreed to work together on the Assumption Island project. Before his visit to India, there were reports from the island nation that it was cancelling the pact with New Delhi. **PTI**

Candidates will have to advertise criminal records from poll expenses: EC

The Election Commission (EC) has made it clear that candidates will have to bear the cost of advertising their criminal antecedents in TV and newspapers as it comes in the category of 'poll expenses'. The poll panel has made it compulsory for candidates contesting elections to advertise their criminal antecedents in TV and newspapers at least thrice during electioneering.

Though directions in this regard were issued on October 10, 2018, the rule is being used for the first time in the ongoing Lok Sabha elections.

EC officials said political parties have been informed

that candidates will have to bear the cost of the advertisement from their poll expenses. Some parties had approached the poll panel urging it to allow the advertisement expenditure be borne by them and not the candidates.

The parties too will have to advertise the criminal records of the candidates they have fielded. The expenditure of advertisement by the parties will be borne by them.

This means that candidates and parties contesting the elections will have to publicise their criminal records at least on three different dates in widely circulated newspapers and popular TV channels during the campaign period.



Candidates who do not have records to mention that. The candidates will now have to fill up an amended form (number 26). They will have to inform parties about their antecedents such as cases in which they have been convicted and cases pending against them.

The parties, the EC said, will be "obliged" to put the information about the candidates on their websites. The EC direction of October, 2018 was silent on whether the candidates will have to pay from their pocket for the publicity.

Parties which fail to comply, face the prospects of getting their recognition withdrawn or

suspended. Candidates have to submit clippings of their declaration published in papers and parties have to submit details about the number of such candidates in a state.

While there is a ceiling on expenditure of candidates, the parties have no such limit. Candidates in Lok Sabha polls can spend up to ₹70 lakh.

All registered political parties have to submit a statement of their election expenditure to the election commission within 90 days of the completion of the Lok Sabha elections.

All candidates are required to submit their expenditure statement to the poll panel within 30 days of the completion of the elections.

CBI calls TDP leader for questioning in bank fraud

The CBI has called former Union Minister and Telugu Desam Party (TDP) leader YS Chowdary for questioning in connection with a bank fraud case. He has been asked to appear on Friday at the agency's office at Bengaluru.

"I can confirm that I do not have any connection, knowledge or acquaintance with the company referred or its affairs at any point time. I will be taking appropriate steps in the matter," Chowdary asserted. The CBI had registered a

case against electrical equipment manufacturer Best and Crompton Engineering Projects Limited for allegedly cheating Andhra Bank to the tune of ₹71 crore in 2017. In its FIR against the Chennai-based company and its five directors, including Managing Director Kakulamarrri Srinivas Kalyan Rao, the CBI has slapped charges under Indian Penal Code sections pertaining to criminal conspiracy, cheating and forgery among others and relevant provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act, they added.

1 hour a day: WHO issues guidelines for under-5 kids' screen time

Watching television or videos or even playing games on mobiles should not be more than an hour at a go for kids under 5, the World Health Organisation (WHO) has said, concerned at the inactivity fueling a rise in the numbers of obese or overweight children worldwide.

Toddlers are most vulnerable to screens. The WHO in its first of its guidelines for the parents said that infants aged 18 months and younger should not be exposed to any digital media.

Obesity in young age can lead to premature death from

heart disease, diabetes, hypertension and some forms of cancer. Also, shorter sleep duration has been associated with more TV viewing and time spent playing computer games, said the global health agency in its guidelines released recently to its member states.

It noted that under-fives should also be physically active and get adequate sleep to help develop good lifelong habits and prevent obesity and other diseases in later life.

"What we are cautioning on is over-use of those electronic screen times with young children," WHO expert Dr. Fiona Bull said in a statement here.



The WHO said children between one and four years old should spend at least three hours in a variety of physical activities spread throughout the day. "Infants under one should interact in floor-based

play and avoid all screens," it said as it noted that being inactive is fueling a rise in the numbers of obese or overweight people worldwide.

"Preventing these deaths needs to start in very early life," Bull said.

One in three adults today are overweight or obese, and one in four adults does not do enough physical activity, she said. "In this age group of under 5s, it is currently 40 million children around the world (who) are overweight. Of that (figure) 50 per cent are in Africa and the southeast Asia region," Bull said. That translates into 5.9 per cent of children globally.

Noting that early childhood is a period of rapid physical and cognitive development during which habits are formed and family lifestyle routines are adaptable, the WHO said, "sedentary behaviors, whether riding motorized transport rather than walking or cycling, sitting at a desk in school, watching TV or playing inactive screen-based games are increasingly prevalent and associated with poor health outcomes."

Chronic insufficient sleep in children has been associated with increased excessive fat accumulation as measured by body mass index (BMI), it said.

New face of terror

Attacks on faith shrines are increasing in South Asia, according to a report. Are we identifying the right sources?



The terrorist attacks in Sri Lanka, the largest in the history of South Asia, are a reminder of how militant groups are now sparking up new hotspots where they had no influence before. And they are doing them on a visually soul less scale, like attacking faith shrines, to attract global shock and awe besides working up least expected touch points in the Philippines, Indonesia, New Zealand, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. That also explains why the Islamic State (IS) chose the relatively calmer Sri Lanka to imprint its signature

despite having an operative base in neighbouring Maldives. Besides, most of South and Southeast Asia are multi-cultural and eclectic societies, which may not host the idea of a monolithic socio-religious identity but where divisions can be fomented by playing on latent communal fears and insecurities. The mosque attacks in Christchurch or the church blasts in Sri Lanka are the manifestations of a global trend of an increasing pattern of hitting at faith shrines in South Asia, a sort of theatre for the new-age crusades, according to the University of Maryland's Global Terrorism Database. The study shows that the region alone accounts for about 24 per cent of all terror strikes on places of worship worldwide between 2000 and 2017. Of the total 1,909 terror attacks on religious institutions globally, 458 incidents have been recorded in the South Asian region, which comprises Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. After Pakistan and Afghanistan, India is reportedly the third-most affected country in the region with 63 terror attacks on religious shrines.

Clearly the IS, which is increasingly under fire in its old strongholds and almost floundering in both Iraq and Syria, has some funding and the digital infra-structural network to rebuild its relevance. So it is spreading to virgin areas, setting off new counter-polarities easily and keeping its need for a global *jihad* alive. As usual, operatives are using online propaganda to radicalise disaffected youth in Europe, recruiting from waning organisations like the Taliban in Afghanistan and Boko Haram in Nigeria and looking for places that have a security vacuum. Sri Lanka fits the bill perfectly on this count because post the decimation of the Tamil militants, the island nation has by and large been peaceful, developed itself as a booming tourist economy and risen on the world map of top beach hotspots. The casualties would be high in such a porous set-up. The surprise element was such that till two days after the blasts happened, nobody had talked about simmering tensions between Sinhala Buddhists and Muslims, which were inherent but never explosive enough. You could say they were contained flashpoints that militant organisations are now linking to stage a new global conflict. If we look at Southeast Asia, then Thailand and the Philippines have had long-standing conflicts along territorial and religious lines. In Indonesia, the Aceh province and Papua island have been in conflict with Jakarta while Bali continues to hold off fundamentalism. Myanmar is riven by issues of ethnicity, territory and religion as the purging of Rohingya Muslims, which sparked an unprecedented humanitarian crisis and further deepened divisions, has shown. Sadly, these attacks have also set up polarised contexts that have further fuelled hate speech and increasingly led to an assertion of identity through new faith shrines. As hate speeches encourage the intolerance of otherness, becoming the new normal, and the attendant fake news factory rapidly unleashes a communication war, the terrorists get a swell of divided sentiments to play upon. As for the States, they are left with little option but to crack down, somewhat at the cost of existing religious freedoms. But curbing terror is just one facet, there is a new face of terror emerging in 2019, one that is not confined to the Middle East but to the former Soviet republics. In 2017, at least 8,500 fighters from former Soviet republics had flocked to Syria and Iraq to join the IS and are now being deployed, given their ease with some European languages, to newer areas. In short, the only way to kill rapidly mutating terror is to be prepared for the unexpected. Till governments form an alliance to think two steps ahead, terror will continue to be the worst scourge of human history.

Don't talk and drive

Drinking while driving is dangerous but using your smartphone while driving is a fast-growing killer



A study by the World Health Organisation (WHO) says in no uncertain terms that those people who use a mobile phone while driving, even with hand-free aids, are four times more likely to have an accident than those who do not. This report emerged on the day when footage went viral of a Delhi resident, who was driving an SUV, running over his three-year-old nephew because he was distracted by his mobile phone. Across the country people are being killed and injured

everyday because car drivers cannot get off their mobile phones in an utter desperate need to stay connected. And are you innocent yourself? Chances are that even you, dear readers, have used a mobile phone while driving. Everyone, car drivers, motorcycle drivers, auto-rickshaw drivers and even rickshaw pullers and pedestrians are on their phones while on public roads, thinking matters need to be attended to immediately than wait. Mobile phones are clearly making matters worse on Indian roads that are downright dangerous with over 150,000 fatalities reported every year.

This at a time when the government is trying to mandate additional safety features in cars and is cracking down on riders, who are not wearing helmets, or car drivers and passengers not using seatbelts. From the middle of this year, new and improved braking systems will become mandatory on motorcycles and cars. Vehicles will additionally be required to have driver and front passenger airbags as well as reversing sensors. All this in the name of safety, but Indian car and motorcycle owners readily play chicken with their lives by using their mobile phones, driving their cars with one hand or cradling phones on their necks. The death of a three-year old is shocking but is it enough to wean people away from a dangerous addiction? The traffic authorities across the country will need to crack down on mobile phone usage with punitive fines and suspensions of driving privileges. However, car makers are now installing several innovative hand-free connected systems on their models but the WHO report also argues that these are only slightly safer. Human beings, particularly the male of the species, are not really wired to multi-task and talking on the phone, even through a hands-free device, could be extremely distracting. And god forbid, if you have an argument and get into a bad mood while on a call, you will almost certainly take your frustration out on the road. The bigger question, therefore, is if a call is worth taking a risk on the move? Simply pull over if you have to.

Imported jihad

Muslim assertiveness is not new in Sri Lanka. But for the first time, the community has turned against Christians. The provocation seems to be imposed rather than indigenous

Sri Lanka is no stranger to violence — a complete generation underwent the ordeals of the Tamil-Sinhala Civil War (1976-2009). But the serial blasts that bloodied the Easter celebrations in the island last Sunday were on a different plane. Its roots seem to puzzle those who had studied the history of Sri Lanka.

Tamil insurgency was an outgrowth of bad blood between the two ethnic communities viz, Tamil and Sinhala, in post-colonial Sri Lanka (then called Ceylon). These two communities, unequal in size and inhabiting different geographical zones of the island, once viewed themselves as co-founders of the island's civilisation. For one complete century between the Colebrooke-Cameron Reforms (1829-32) — which gave colonial Ceylon a legislative council — and the Donoughmore Commission (1931), when territorial elections were introduced, the relationship between the Tamils and Sinhalese deteriorated sharply.

The Tamils, though in a numerical minority, could previously take a much-relaxed view as long as their representation in the Council was the same as the Sinhalese. But as political reforms progressed in the crown colony, relationships worsened under the shadow of Sinhala majoritarianism. The Tamils were the makers of modern Ceylon. But they found themselves falling from the frying pan to the fire after Ceylon gained independence.

Between 1951 and 1976, one finds Tamils trying to fashion various political responses to the Sinhala clout. Then finally came the Vaddukottai Resolution (May 14, 1976), which pitched for an independent "Tamil Eelam", an expression first used in modern time as early as 1923 by Sir Ponnambalam Arunachalam (1853-1924). The uncrowned king of Ceylonese Tamil civil politics viz, SJV Chelvanayakam (1898-1977), exhorted the Tamil youth to take up arms to resist Sinhalese hegemony.

An independent Tamil Eelam was, thus, not the brainchild of either the Tamil Eelam Liberation Organisation (TELO), or the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) or People's Liberation Organisation of Tamil Eelam (PLOTE). But a resolution passed by those politicians who had tried to handle the issue by Constitutional means far too long without any success. The situation erupted into a bloody, messy and cruel civil war that lasted for three decades. It ended in May 2009 with the defeat of the LTTE by the Sri Lankan Army, accompanied by the carnage of Tamils caught in the crossfire.

The Easter bloodbath, on the other hand, does not seem to be an outgrowth of natural politics. It was directed against Christians (regardless of ethnicity) and foreigners, who stay in plush hotels like Shangri-La, Cinnamon Grand and



Kingsbury in Colombo. The blasts coincided with the US-Sri Lanka Naval exercise off the Hambantota Port, owned by China on a 99-year lease.

The Sri Lankan Government found the blasts to be the handiwork of Islamic radicals, and the Islamic State has claimed responsibility for the bombings. Both Christians and Muslims are small minorities and do not hope to play an independent role in the overall politics of the island. They do not have a history of turning against one another as a group either.

The Muslims, who have a dominant presence in eastern districts like Batticaloa and Trincomalee, could still foster some territorial ambitions. But Christians, who are to be found both among Sinhalese and Tamils besides Burghese (who are Anglo-Indians in Sri Lanka), can at best manage to influence politics as part of some group.

Various Prime Ministers and Presidents of Sri Lanka, right from DS Senanayake to Mahinda Rajapaksa, have had a Christian family background. Christian presence in Sri Lanka goes back to Portuguese invasions in the 16th century. Various Sinhalese (Buddhists) and Tamil (Hindus) had con-

verted to Christianity. But as the Donoughmore Commission (1931) recommended franchise base on territory, many of those leading families re-converted to Buddhism to ingratiate themselves to the masses. They are generally referred to as "Donoughmore Buddhists."

Interestingly, it was such families, who remained at the helm of Sri Lankan politics but it was not before Ranasinghe Premadasa (1924-1993), a genuine Buddhist, who became the Sri Lankan President, that they held an official post. However, such re-converted families were never shy of using Buddhism as a state policy to marginalise the Tamils.

Those who remained Christians (amongst Sinhalese and Burghese) felt political power passing away from their hands. In January 1962, there was a "Christian coup d'état", popularly called "Operation Holdfast", to overthrow the democratically-elected Government of the then Prime Minister Sirimavo Bandaranaike. The top brass of the Army, Navy and police involved in it were Christians, and pained that Bandaranaike was advancing the policies of her slain husband SWRD Bandaranaike which related to

the aggressive "Buddhitisation" of Sri Lanka. But the attempt was exposed and neutralised.

During the Civil War, the Christians settled down on the respective side of the ethnic divide. While the Sinhalese Christians tried to prove their Sinhalese credentials, the Tamil Christians were active in the LTTE. Young women from Tamil Christian families were the first to volunteer for LTTE's woman brigade. This was because they were comparatively free from the conservatism of Hindu families. The Muslims, though they were Tamil-speaking, did not join the LTTE. They eventually came to be at the receiving end of the LTTE's policies. In the Kattankudy mosque massacre, 147 Muslim men and boys were killed on August 3, 1990, by the LTTE.

The Muslims, though Tamil-speaking, did not consider themselves as part of the Tamil nation. Way back in 1885, a debate arose when Sir Ponnambalam Ramanathan (1851-1930), in a speech to the Ceylon Legislative Council, had tried to prove that Tamil Muslims were descendants of low-class Tamil Hindus, who had converted to Islam. The Muslim community (then called Moors in Ceylon) was enraged and argued that they

were descendants of Arab traders, who settled down in the island centuries ago and gradually adopted Tamil while forgetting Arabic.

Muslim assertiveness is not new in Sri Lanka. Way back in 1915, there were Candy riots between Sinhalese (Buddhists) and Muslims. Last year in March 2018, there were similar clashes between Sinhalese and Muslims. Religious places of each community were attacked by the other. But this is the first time in historical memory that Muslims have turned against the Christians. The provocation seems to be imported rather than indigenous. The terror attacks rather seem to be part of the global *jihad* or more particularly, retaliation for Christchurch mosque attack on March 15. In recent years, missionary activities by Christians and Muslims are on the rise in the island. These terror attacks, though a grave security risk, might not indicate any shift in the politics of Sri Lanka. But it is a signal that *Jihad bi-al Qital* has appeared on the shores of the palm-fringed island.

A new vehicle for real estate growth

As India makes a foray into a new investment model, its success will depend on an efficient regulatory system that can ensure best interests of all

One may not be aware but Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) sway our life consistently. From the place where we live, to where we work, REITs surround us. A great many people don't have the time or resources to buy or manage large-scale income-producing real estate. But the good news is that REITs allow us to own a share of the kind of real estate that would have otherwise been financially out of reach. How? These are mutual funds-like institutions that enable individuals to purchase/sell REITs on open stock trades.

Benefits of investing in REITs: Global capital allocation towards REITs is increasing exponentially. In a major signoff, investors have started taking fancy to Indian real estate — the sector has garnered a whopping ₹8,000 crore in the last fortnight alone. This comprises the ₹3,200 crore QIP by DLF and the Blackstone-Embassy combine, raising ₹4,750 crore in India's first ever REIT offering. Private equity players have invested close to \$53 billion since 2008 in India's real estate story. For investors, the chance to own a share of valuable real estate has meant income as well as diversification for their investment portfolios.

To qualify as a REIT, an entity must have a bulk of its assets and income connected to real estate investments. It must also distribute at least 90 per cent of its taxable income as dividends to shareholders. As a result of these necessities, REITs give a one-of-a-kind mix of all-out return that sits among stocks and bonds. By comparison, equity returns have mainly come due to capital appreciation. Fixed income returns have been more dependent on income or coupons. An extraordinary blend of development and required investor payouts that REITs give may be appealing to add up to return financial specialists with a pay centre. Alongside their extraordinary, income-oriented attributes, REITs may likewise help diversify a portfolio and lower the overall risk. In addition to strong historical performance, it is believed that going forward, opportunities for real estate investors will keep coming. The current REIT cycle has been a bit lengthy but long and persistent economic cycles are common in real estate. Given the nature, rising loan fees are worth considering. In these periods, REITs have really been extensively increasing adaptability, completely beating fixed pay after some time.

Success of first REIT and impact on real estate: REITs in India are expected to provide people with an opportunity to invest in fixed income securities, which also provide long-term capital appreciation. Due to limited investment opportunities, savings made by such investors are usually channelised into gold and housing, which are unproductive assets. As an investment, REITs are expected to convert such capital into productive assets. Additionally, they open to little financial specialists a field (for example, lease creating land resources) that was until now the syndication of extensive financial specialists. Since REITs have to distribute 90 per cent of the income back to shareholders, the returns are higher than the stock market. It will help developers improve their debt-equity balance and assist in the growth of a more stable and mature market. REITs, being pure equity capital, will also provide developers with institutional capital to sell their assets and utilise funds for further development or paring of bank debt. With access to public markets for IPOs not being a short to medium term option for developers in India, this option is all the more attractive.

The real estate sector is strongly associated with infrastructure and is fundamental to its growth. Given its capital-intensive nature and the limited options available to developers as well as owners for raising funds, REITs offer a way forward. In general terms, a REIT is an investment vehicle that owns and operates real estate-related assets and allows investors to earn income produced through ownership of commercial real estate without actually having to buy an asset. Typically, the income-producing real estate assets possessed by a REIT incorporate office buildings, shopping malls, apartments, warehouses and mortgaged property. REITs were first introduced in the US in the early 1960s and have since been adopted as a preferred investment mode across the world. Over the years, they have constructively changed the way the real estate market operates, benefitting investors and developers.

Thus, the success of REITs in any country depends on its capability to customise rules and regulations governing REITs in such a way that they fit into individual markets. The support of governing authorities to ensure a less restrictive REIT regime and favourable tax transparency status is a critical factor in the development of a vibrant REIT sector in a new market. To conclude, India has the entire gradient to witness a successful REIT regime in the long-term. All that is required is an efficient regulatory system framed that can ensure the best interest of the investor, the market and economy, while also making the instrument attractive in terms of greater yield and less risk to entice domestic and foreign investors.

Roots of Islamophobia

Anti-Muslim sentiment has become a tool for populist politicians to describe Muslims as the 'other' and the ones to blame for the economic or cultural decline of a Western country

On March 15, when a horrendous attack by a White Australian supremacist left 50 Muslims dead in a mosque in New Zealand, the Prime Minister of Pakistan, Imran Khan, fired a series of tweets against Islamophobia. Interestingly, in Pakistan, the tweets received some rather mixed responses. Many accused him of exhibiting "outright hypocrisy" while others were more tongue-in-cheek in their response, pointing out that it was ironic that a Prime Minister of a country, where religious and sectarian minorities are constantly attacked by radical Islamist outfits, should be lamenting the state of Islamophobia in the West. Indeed, there is always much irony in Muslim states that overtly criticise Islamophobia while doing precious little to address the persecution of minority faiths or sects in their own realms. Therefore, a prominent Muslim (or for that matter, any Muslim) should be very careful in his/her criticism of Islamophobia. If their laments are to be taken seriously, without sounding so obviously contradictory, then they should be well-informed about the inherent contradictions that these laments carry. The wording of their criticism should, thus, be a more measured exercise.

Prime Minister Khan should have observed how Pakistan's military establishment has been wording its responses in this context. Ever since 2015 — when the military initiated a widespread operation against militant outfits — it condemns violence against Muslims elsewhere but always attaches a reminder to it that Pakistan has fought a vicious war against religious terrorism and won. This somewhat neutralises the contradictions that emerge when a country, with a history of sectarian bloodshed and violence against minorities, wags a finger at a country guilty of exhibiting Islamophobia. Because when this question does arise, it is countered by the reminder that Pakistan is actually doing something about it.

But Prime Minister Khan went slightly off the rails in his tweeted outrage against Islamophobia. He failed to balance his critique by confessing that Pakistan, too, has a problem of religiously-motivated violence but one that it is trying to address seriously.

But when he was in Opposition, Khan and his party had actually opposed any serious action against religious militancy. Yet, it is also true that the complex reality of being in power is gradually transforming his views. So one now expects him to be a bit more aware when commenting on the violence unleashed by White supremacists against Muslims.

But what really is Islamophobia? This question needs to be answered in a more thorough manner, especially by the Muslims themselves if they are to critique it without sounding contradictory. According to the Oxford English Dictionary, Islamophobia is an "intense dislike or fear of Islam." In an article in the October 2015 issue of *The Atlantic*, Tanya Basu wrote that the term was derived by the French word, "Islamophobic." It was first coined by French author Alain Quellien in 1910 to criticise the behaviour of French colonial administrators



towards their Muslim subjects.

In her essay for the March 2006 issue of the *Journal of Interpersonal Violence*, LP Sheridan wrote that the term's first known usage in English appeared some 90 years later in 1991. It then made its way into the Oxford English Dictionary in 1997. This suggests that Islamophobia, as it is understood today, is a recent development. Professor Emeritus Bichara Khader, in his essay for the 2016 anthology, *The Search for Europe*, wrote that Islamophobia in Europe and the US is often linked to migrants from Muslim countries that are seen as a threat to Western culture and security.

He questioned this assumption by adding that migration was not an issue at all in the West till the early 1970s, after thousands of Muslims from South Asia, South East Asia, the Middle East and North Africa began arriving in various European cities from the 1950s onward. They were looking for work and higher wages. Khader wrote that as post-war economies boomed in Europe, these migrants were seen as being vital contributors to this boom. He added that it was only when the economies of Europe began to recede — especially after the 1973 oil crisis — the term "migration problem" came into play.

Yet, it was never linked to a "Muslim problem" as it is today. Khader said that during the turmoil of the 1970s and 1980s — which saw riots involving migrants and locals, especially in France and England — these were explained as "race riots" and also included migrants from the Caribbean islands and non-Muslim Indians. The reasons were economic.

Neo-fascist outfits accused their Governments of allowing non-white migrants to steal "white jobs." It really wasn't a clash of cultures as such. Or not yet. According to Khader, till the early 1980s, Muslim migrants

were not very public or exhibitionistic about their faith. For example, they were happy with a few basement mosques.

Once settled, Muslim migrants began to marry women from their own countries and then brought them to Europe — even though it wasn't uncommon for some to marry European women as well. Khader wrote that most of the women who came as wives, were from rural and semi-rural areas of Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, Indonesia and Egypt among others. This development changed the settlers' attitude towards their religion and cultural values. Whereas once they were fine with their small 'basement mosques', now they began to demand proper mosques.

The change in behaviour attracted preachers, who began to set up shop in various European cities. They were particularly appealing to second generation migrants, especially from families who had failed to be fully integrated by European integration policies. Khader wrote that, as the presence of veiled women and mosques grew, this is when the 'migration problem' began to be seen as a 'Muslim problem', triggering Islamophobia.

Authors such as Khader and George Morgan in (Muslims and Moral Panic in the West) agree that the more outward exhibition of 'Muslimness' in the West did contribute in the making of the above-mentioned scenario. Nevertheless, they are of the view that Islamophobia is still largely a construct of populist right-wing parties.

Khader wrote that there are 23 million Muslims in Europe. This means they are just five per cent of Europe's total population. Thus, Islamophobia has become a tool for populist politicians to describe Muslims as the 'other' and the ones to blame for the economic or cultural decline of a Western country.

Establish the rule of law

Without getting into the nitty-gritty of the allegations against the CJI, it is imperative that an impartial hearing, based on settled principles, be held. However, by not providing for just representation of women in the enquiry committee, the court has undermined the POSH Act

On April 19, a complaint of sexual harassment against the Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi (CJI) was sent to the Residence(s) of 22 judges of the Supreme Court of India, along with an affidavit and other supporting evidence. The complainant had asked for the constitution of an inquiry committee of senior retired judges to investigate and adjudicate on the serious allegations of sexual harassment.

Under the Indian law, complaint(s) of sexual harassment at the workplace are required to be addressed in accordance with the procedure, as established under the Sexual Harassment of Women

at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (POSH Act). The Act mandates that every organisation — with more than 10 employees — must set up an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), comprising at least four members and 50 per cent of them should be women. Further, it also states that the presiding officer of the ICC should also be a woman.

Thus, the spirit of the POSH Act lies in providing women greater representation in the inquiry committee and in including an external member on the board to ensure transparency and fairness.

The Supreme Court has constituted an ICC and also framed The Gender Sensitisation & Sexual Harassment of Women at the Supreme Court of India (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Regulations 2013, to investigate the complaints of sexual harassment.

However, in gross violation of the procedure as established by the law and in absolute negation of the

'rule of law', the Supreme Court on April 20, held a *suo moto* hearing of the complaint. The Bench comprised three male judges, presided by the CJI himself.

On acute criticism by various lawyers and Bar Association(s) of the *suo moto* hearing held by the apex court, on April 23, a special Bench comprising three male judges issued notice to a lawyer, Utsav Bains, who claimed that a man had approached him to file a false case of sexual harassment against the CJI. However, no investigation was instituted to examine the veracity of the complaint of sexual harassment.

Then in a series of surprises, the top court constituted a new Bench on April 23, comprising two male and a female Supreme Court judges to examine the complaint of sexual harassment against the CJI. This Bench issued notice to the complainant on April 24 and directed her to appear before the Bench on April 26, that is today.

In setting up a predominantly male Bench, headed by a male judge

(even though there are three sitting women judges at the Supreme Court) the court has side-stepped and corroded the sanctity of the predominantly women-led ICC.

Undoubtedly and inherently, a reason exists for POSH to insist on a committee led by a woman with them being in majority. This, to provide an environment conducive for a woman to speak freely and fearlessly about a sexual assault on her physical body. Presence of women members in majority can ease, facilitate and enable them to speak about incidents that outraged their soul.

It is fearsome and intimidating for them to express about unwanted physical contact by men in authority before strange men. Ask any woman — no matter how rich or powerful, educated or illiterate — whether they would be able to explain the gory and graphic details of the violence committed before strange men.

To facilitate, enable and create a conducive environment — where victims are encouraged to speak

freely in the presence of other women — POSH insists on this specific composition which must necessarily be strictly and scrupulously adhered. Any breach would only further perpetuate injustice.

In not providing more representation to women in the committee and by not including an external member, the Supreme Court has undermined the sanctity of the POSH Act.

The apex court has been the torch-bearer of women's right to equality and safe spaces. The court itself laid down the Visakha Guidelines in 1997 to protect women against sexual harassment and abuse at workplace. Even thereafter, it took almost 15 years for the POSH law to be enacted.

The POSH Act is unique. This progressive and welfare legislation cannot be permitted to be undermined lest Indian women lose their right to safe work places.

Without getting into the merits of the allegations levelled against the CJI, it is imperative that a fair and impartial hearing of the mat-

ter be conducted that is based on the settled principles and the procedure established by the law. This is a *sine qua non* for upholding the rule of law.

Looking at the gravity of the complaint at hand and in keeping with the spirit and objectives of the POSH Act, the Supreme Court must lead by example and ensure that the presiding officer and majority of the members of the inquiry committee are women. Further, the board must include external member/members as well.

It is incumbent on all citizens of India, especially women, to voice their concern on side-stepping of the women-led complaints committee in a matter of sexual harassment.

If we choose to remain quiet on this grave violation of principles of natural justice and the procedure established by the law, it will send the Indian women back to decades. The spirit and sanctity of the POSH Act must be fiercely protected, preserved and prevented from being reduced to a mockery.

'PM using my civility for political gain'

While articles as innocuous as "chuninda Kurta" and "Bangali Mithai" threatening to upset Mamata Banerjee's minority appellation, the Bengal Chief Minister on Thursday took initiative to control damage done by Narendra Modi's off-the-cuff remark on how "Didi occasionally sends him chuninda Kurta and Bangali Mithai."

In an apparent bid to establish her political difference with Modi more than ever before, the Chief Minister on Thursday mounted a no-holds-barred attack on the Prime Minister saying courtesy was the last thing that would appear in his dictionary.

"I sent him kurta and sweets as I regularly do to the other politicians irrespective of their political identity. But that is a part of my courtesy and here this man is trying to make use of that to gain political points," Banerjee told a huge rally at Durgapur adding "I send such gifts during the Durga Pujas which represents my culture and upbringing."

The Prime Minister had in an interview to film star Akshay Kumar said that "though this may cause some



political flutter I must concede that Mamata Didi often sends me choicest kurta mostly selected by her personally. In fact after learning that I had liked the sweets sent to me by Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, she did the same by regularly sending me some delicious Bangali Mithai."

A subsequent statement by Bengal BJP chief Dilip Ghosh tended to rub salt in injury when he claimed "I have no problems in sending gifts. Even I have a good personal relationship with the Chief Minister. I appreciate her gesture when she calls me up to inquire after my health whenever I am unwell."

The Prime Ministerial interview was televised on Wednesday causing an immediate reaction in the ruling

Trinamool Congress circle even as Banerjee's nephew and MP Abhishek Banerjee said "had such gifts been sent to him why he did not make it public earlier and why is he telling it now."

Banerjee who earlier said that she would "send gifts to him but not allow him to take votes," on Thursday increased her decibel level following reports that the Left Front the earlier 'custodians' of the minority votes in the State had gone to town (read villages) raising questions on the "setting (read adjustment) between Didibhai and Modibhai."

This even as Bengal CPI(M) secretary and party politburo member Suryokanto Mishra said "the Prime Minister has finally spilled the bin exposing the real chemistry between the two sides. We have been for long being telling how the two sides were working on an adjustment basis which first started in 2001 when Mamata Banerjee sent a bouquet to Modi when he became the Chief Minister of Gujarat."

The Left leaders like Sujjan Chakrabarty also demanded to know from the Prime Minister as to "reveal what more she has been sending to you," or "whether she has gifted you her

right hand Mukul Roy, and many other leaders of the TMC and whether she has gifted you away the entire TMC in Tripura to win power there."

In an apparent bid to control damage and to establish her claim as the true champion of the minority cause — that constitutes about 30 percent vote in the State, Banerjee said.

Upping the ante the Chief Minister reminded how the Prime Minister had "promised 2 crore jobs per year but ended up taking away 3 crores in five years of his rule. Most of such jobs were lost during the demonetisation which in itself is a big scam and will be probed when we come to power."

LS polls will see end of those chanting Namō, Namō: Maya

Kannauj (UP): The ongoing Lok Sabha election will see the end of those chanting 'Namō, Namō', BSP supremo Mayawati said on Thursday, while SP chief Akhilesh Yadav expressed confidence that the SP-BSP-RLD alliance will give a new Prime Minister to the country.

Both the former Uttar Pradesh Chief Ministers were addressing a joint poll rally here, along with Rashtriya Lok Dal (RLD) president Ajit Singh, in favour of Dimple Yadav, the joint candidate of the opposition alliance from Kannauj.

Dimple, the sitting Samajwadi Party (SP) MP and the wife of Akhilesh Yadav, is seeking re-election from this parliamentary seat.

"This election will see the end of those chanting 'Namō, Namō' and pave the way for those who shout Jai Bheem. Seeing your response, it appears that you are going to ensure the victory of the alliance candidates," Mayawati told the crowd.

Yadav called Prime Minister Narendra Modi a "prachar mantri", or minister for publicity, and claimed that the SP-BSP-RLD combine in Uttar Pradesh will give the country a new PM.

"Last time he came as a 'chaiwala' (tea seller) and you tasted his tea. This time he has come as a chowkidar (watchman)," he mocked Modi.

"This alliance will give a new prime minister to the country and we will make a new Bharat," the SP chief said.

He added that the opposition alliance is aimed at ensuring social justice and taking forward the ideals of B R Ambedkar, Ram Manohar Lohia, Kanshi Ram and Mulayam Singh Yadav.

Criticising the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government over demonetisation, Yadav

asked, "Has demonetisation eradicated corruption? Where is the black money? They have made the country hollow with their policies."

Earlier, his wife Dimple claimed that the BJP was conspiring to deprive the backward classes and Dalits of education and employment.

Playing the caste card to the hilt, Mayawati reminded the electorate that the Congress did not implement the Mandal Commission report.

She also said when the Congress was in power, it did not give Bharat Ratna to Ambedkar.

Woman forced to drink acid after voting for Cong

In a gruesome incident relating to post-poll violence, a homemaker was allegedly forced to gulp down acid by her in-laws. Her fault: she had voted for Congress Party. The incident took place on Tuesday at Mohanpur village in Murshidabad parliamentary constituency and came to light on Thursday.

Makhan Biwi, the victim was fighting for her life in hospital, son Rafzal said. "My mother was pulled back home by her hair after she emerged from inside the booth. I tried to protect her but my father,

grandfather and uncles locked me inside a room. From there I saw them forcing acid in my mouth and pouring acid in it."

The boy and his sister were also beaten up for trying to intervene, he said adding her mother had allegedly voted for the Congress which was not liked by his family which backed the TMC. Murshidabad had already seen one poll-related death and three near-fatal injuries on Tuesday with alleged TMC goons stabbing to death a Congress worker. In other incidents three TMC workers were grievously injured in attack mounted by the CPI(M) and Congress.

Akhilesh, Maya, Cong cannot keep country safe: Amit Shah

Ghaziपुर/Unnao (UP): BJP president Amit Shah on Thursday claimed Opposition leaders cannot look after the country's security.

Addressing a rally in Ghaziपुर constituency of Uttar Pradesh, he alleged BSP supremo Mayawati and her Samajwadi Party and Congress counterparts, Akhilesh Yadav and Rahul Gandhi, respectively, were upset with the Balakot air strikes.

"These 'mahamilavati' people talk about the country. Akhilesh, Mayawati and Congress cannot keep the country safe," he said.

Shah said the BJP cannot do "ilu-ilu" with terrorists, an apparent reference to the popular short form of 'I love you'.

"Though terrorists of Pakistan were killed (in the Balakot air strikes), there was an atmosphere of mourning in the offices of 'Bua' (Mayawati), 'Bhatija' (Akhilesh) and 'Rahul baba'," he said.

"I could not find out as to why they were so sad. Why were

they moving about with long faces? Were those terrorists their maternal or paternal cousins?" he said.

The BJP chief asserted his party cannot play with the security of the country.

"If a bullet is fired from there (Pakistan), a bomb will be sent from here (India)... Eent ka jawaab patthar se diya jayega (If someone throws bricks, will respond by throwing rocks)," he said. Shah alleged the Congress want to break the nation with the "tukde-tukde" gang.

Pointing to the promise of scrapping sedition law in the Congress manifesto, the BJP leader claimed the move is to prevent those raising "anti-national" slogans from going to jails. Union Minister and sitting MP Manoj Sinha is seeking re-election from the Ghaziपुर seat.

The BJP president also alleged that Purvanchal lagged behind under the Congress governments, and came on the right track of progress after the BJP came to power. Attacking the previous UPA

government, he said the ten years when "mauni baba" (apparent reference to former PM Manmohan Singh) was at the helm, soldiers were beheaded and the government took no action.

"This is not happening anymore... Terror strikes took place and the Modi government carried out air strikes... The martyrdom of our soldiers was avenged with surgical strikes," he said.

Taking a dig at Rahul Gandhi's "silence" over NC leader Omar Abdullah's "separate PM" remarks, Shah said, "Rahul Gandhi does not speak a word on Omar Abdullah as he fears that if he does, voters will go away."

Omar had recently suggested separate prime minister for Kashmir.

Addressing another meeting in Unnao for party nominee Sakshi Maharaj, the senior BJP leader said the Yogi Adityanath-led state government has been successful at checking "gunda" (hooligans) elements.

PM did 'injustice' with people in last 5 years: Rahul

Jalore/Ajmer/Kota: Congress president Rahul Gandhi on Thursday accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi of doing "injustice" to the people of the country in the last five years, saying the 'acche din ayenge' slogan has now been replaced by 'chowkidar chor hai'.

He said there will be only one 'Hindustan' where justice will be done when the Congress is voted to power.

During the day, Gandhi addressed election rallies at Jalore, Ajmer and Kota in Rajasthan.

"If rich people are not jailed for not paying off loans then farmers too will not be jailed. If lakhs and crores are given to them then the same will be given to farmers, labourers, tribals, Dalits and small traders. There will be no injustice in Hindustan. The country will not be divided in two Hindustans. There will be one Hindustan where justice will be done," the Congress president said at a rally in Jalore.

"PM Narendra Modi did injustice with people of the country in the last five years.

Demonetisation and GST were ways to rob poor, labourers, small traders of their money, NYAY scheme will benefit them," he alleged.

He said the Congress government will listen to people's 'mann ki baat' and run according to them.

"Five years ago, there was a slogan 'acche din ayenge' (good

days will come). Now people say 'chowkidar chor hai' (watchman is a thief) everywhere in the country," he said.

Addressing a gathering in Ajmer, Gandhi said, "On one side there is Narendra Modi who speaks lies one after the other wherever he goes and on the other side, there is truth. Depositing Rs 15 lakh in bank

accounts, two crore jobs every year, reasonable price for farmers' crops were all lies."

He said the Congress had done brainstorming with eminent economists for minimum income guarantee 'Nyay' scheme to deposit Rs 72,000 annually in individual bank accounts of 25 crore poor people.

The Congress president said that people of the country heard 'Mann ki Baat' in the past five years but the Congress' think-tank has done 'kaam ki Baat' by formulating the NYAY scheme.

"I want to thank Modi Ji for opening bank accounts. I am going to deposit money of NYAY scheme in the same accounts. The money will be deposited directly in bank accounts of women of the families," he said at an election rally in Kota.

Gandhi stressed that the money deposited through the NYAY scheme will move the wheels of the economy and create job opportunities for the youth.

He said the Congress government, if voted to power, will fill 22 lakh government jobs in one year, separate budget for farmers, reservation for women in state assemblies, Parliament and in Government jobs. He alleged that the prime minister is "protecting 15 rich people", including Mehul Choksi, Anil Ambani, Lalit Modi and Nirav Modi, who took bank loans worth several crore and did not pay back.

TMC announces candidates for Assembly bypolls

Banerjee also extended support for Gorkha Janmukti Morcha (GJM) leader Binay Tamang in Darjeeling assembly seat, which was vacated by Amar Singh Rai who is contesting from Darjeeling Lok Sabha constituency as a joint GJM-TMC candidate.

CAT stays suspension of IAS officer who checked PM Modi's helicopter

Bengaluru: The Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) here on Thursday stayed the order of the Election Commission suspending IAS officer Mohammed Mohsin for checking Prime Minister Narendra Modi's helicopter in Odisha.

The officer from Karnataka cadre, deployed in Odisha as a general observer, was suspended on April 17 for checking Modi's helicopter in Odisha's Sambalpur in violation of norms for dealing with SPG protectees and sent back to the state.

The CAT maintained that during an election process while reasonable assurances of protection and security must be made available to SPG protectees, it cannot be said "they are eligible for anything and



everything."

Mohsin had tried to check some luggage in the convoy of the Prime Minister and the EC order had said he had acted in violation of existing instructions of the commission.

In its order, the CAT, which adjudicates disputes involving central government employees, noted that there was a circular regarding the SPG protectees that they are exempted from certain examinations on certain grounds.

It also said, "We will not go into the SPG protectees guide-

lines as per the bluebook right now but the rule of law must prevail."

The tribunal also took note of the submission of the applicant's counsel who pointed out that there were news about heavy packages unloaded from prime minister's cavalcade being taken away in other vehicle.

"It has been laid down that SPG protectees are exempted from checking. He should have known the instruction being an observer. The reason for suspension is dereliction of duty," a source in the EC had said following suspension.



Their chief Ram Rahim in jail, Dera followers yet to decide who to vote for

Sirsa (Haryana): Since the self-styled godman Gurmeet Ram Rahim was sentenced to life imprisonment in January for killing a journalist, followers of his Dera Sacha Sauda have been lying low at the sprawling 800-acre campus outside Sirsa in Haryana.

The followers say they are also unsure about who to support in this election.

The Dera has been an important vote bank for parties for over a decade. In 2007, it had formed a political affairs wing which decided which political party or politician it will support.



Assembly election, it supported the Congress.

Dera openly supported the BJP. But after the sentencing of their flamboyant but controversial chief, the Dera and its political affairs wing became dysfunctional, locals and followers said.

This, however, has not stopped political parties, including the BJP and the INLD, from saying they will not refrain from seeking support of the once-influential Dera Sacha Sauda.

BJP leader and Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar has said he was not averse to Dera support in Lok Sabha election, and defended his stance, saying it is a political party's "right to seek votes

in an election". INLD leader Abhay Singh Chautala too has said his party will seek the Dera's support.

Punjab Congress chief Sunil Jakhar has ruled that option out. Jakhar said, "We shall not compromise with Sirsa Dera for the election after sacrilege (incidents) have been traced to it."

That political parties have made their stance clear may not have a bearing on the Dera followers, who say they are clueless.

"There used to be public meetings and then a decision was taken. It used to be of course not binding but suggestive in nature. But this

time, everyone is clueless about who will the Dera support," said Chinder Kaur, whose family has been the sect's supporter for decades.

A Dera functionary, who did not wish to be identified, said, "Guru ji never told us who to vote for."

"It was the political affairs wing of the Dera to which political parties used to reach out and then public meetings were held with followers and a decision was taken," the functionary said.

Several Dera followers, who did not wish to come on record, said the political affairs wing is almost redundant and hence the followers

will have to make their individual choices.

"It is not just the political affairs wing but everything about Dera has come to a standstill. The manufacturing plants for aloe vera products, bottled water, car batteries and confectionery items are shut," said Babita Gautam, who lives near the Dera campus.

Gautam said many people have been rendered jobless because of the closure of the Dera units. "So whom to vote for is still a question in our neighbourhood."

In August 2017, a special CBI court sentenced the 50-year-old Ram Rahim to 20 years of impris-

onment for raping two female followers.

His conviction in the 2002 case triggered widespread violence, arson and police firing. Thousands of Dera followers rampaged through parts of Haryana. Over 40 people died.

Though the Dera has tumbled since then, Ram Rahim's followers and those who had a stake in his business live in large numbers in Sirsa and surrounding districts. It is yet to be seen how they react in the polls.

Polling in Haryana, which has 10 Lok Sabha constituencies, will be held on May 12.

2 Hizbul terrorists killed in Anantnag

A joint team of security forces early Thursday morning neutralised two Hizbul Mujahideen terrorists, including an under graduate, pursuing course in Physiotherapy, in Bagender Mohalla of Bijbehara in South Kashmir's Anantnag district.

Security forces suffered no collateral damage in the clinical operation, launched in the thickly populated area after receiving a specific intelligence input about the presence of armed terrorists in the area.

Since one of the terrorists neutralised in the gun fight was a resident of Bijbehara, sporadic protests were reported in the area at several places.

The security forces exercised restraint to contain the law and order situation.

Police spokesman said, "security forces on Thursday

morning recovered two dead bodies from the hide out after the encounter was called off in the area". One of the terrorist was identified as Safder Amin Bhat, a ninth class drop out, resident of village Zirpara in Bijbehara. He was active in the area since May 2017, police spokesman said.

Another terrorist, according to police was identified as Burhan Ahmad Ganie alias Saifullah.

After completing his class 12, Burhan was pursuing a graduate course in Physiotherapy. He is a resident of Malipora Hablish, Kulgam, at present residing in SK Colony of Anantnag. He was active in the area since June 2018.

Police also recovered one AK rifle and one SLR from their hideout.

Meanwhile, security has been beefed up along the 300 km long Jammu-Srinagar

National Highway ahead of the shifting of the Durbar move offices from April 27.

Due to strict security related restrictions, the state government has chalked out a comprehensive schedule of movement of durbar move employees to ensure their hassle free travel.

To prevent any attack on the movement of the vehicles elaborate security arrangements would remain in place.

In the wake of regular suspension of traffic on account of land sliding on the National Highway the state government has already made parallel arrangements across different district headquarters to meet any contingency.

Due to security restrictions on the highway the state government has also appealed to the state govt employees to remain alert and respond to the situation appropriately.

IN BARMER'S LAST BORDER VILLAGE

Farmers mortgage jewellery to feed their cattle

Barmer: Hajeeb Ali, 70, had to mortgage his wife's jewellery to feed fodder to his beloved cattle in Bandasar, a last village in Barmer Lok Sabha constituency along the international border with Pakistan. Ali is not alone in his village, a Muslim-dominated area.

There are many in Bandasar who are facing acute difficulties for a long time to arrange fodder in Barmer, which has no pasture land for cattle.

Shortage of fodder is a major poll issue in the Thar district Lok Sabha constituency.

Ali says in every election, candidates of political parties come to the village to seek votes, but after winning polls, they never return.

A drought is a bad time for cattle as their source of food dries up, even if they are abandoned and allowed to roam freely by farmers.

In Bandasar and 150 villages nearby, small and big — such as Munabav, Ramsar, Bhigusi, Gagaria, Bhajpar, Derasar and Bikusar, when there is no rain, farmers have to



look for other things, including working under MGNREGA and going to Ahmedabad, around 500 kilometers from Bandasar, in search of work to feed both family and cattle.

Ali has 28 cows and calves. But, he said, he and his wife, who considered them as a part of their family, worry every two-three days as to how to arrange fodder instead of feeding their children as arrangement of their food cost them much less than what cattle eat.

He says he has around 100 acre land in Bandasar, but it is lying useless as he cannot use it

because of the drought-situation.

"I had to mortgage 170 grams of gold jewellery of my wife to arrange money for fodder for my cattle. I and my wife consider cattle like our family. Our cattle is everything to us.

"Government should find a permanent solution to this problem existing across the Thar desert area," Ali said.

When there is rain, pasture land is easily available for cattle, Subha Momin, another villager, said.

Ramesh Chand, a former

sarpanch of the nearby border village of Gatra, said the Rajasthan government used to run fodder camps where cattle food was available at subsidised rates for farmers, but for the last three years, no such camp has been organised.

Chand also said that farmers having not more than 12 acres of land would only be covered by the scheme, and because of this, most farmers, who have desert land ranging from 40 to 100 acres, are deprived of state-run programmes.

There are around 300 small and big villages in Barmer Lok Sabha constituency, falling within a 50-70 -km radius from the international border.

Government has constructed concrete wells to store rain water, but this is only useful when there is good amount of rainfall.

Due to water scarcity in the desert area, people have to shell out Rs 2,000 to 3,000 to buy 2,500 litres of water which is used for both family members and cattle.

"Not only Barmer, the

entire Thar desert area of Rajasthan has been facing water scarcity. But government is doing nothing. Being far-reach areas, candidates come only for campaigning, and once elections are over, nobody comes to these villages," says Changa, who goes by his first name.

Apart from shortage of fodder and water scarcity, health is also an issue in those villages where no hospital facility has been set up by authorities.

Desar village, 50 km from the international border, has a population of 6,000 persons, but it and its nearby areas do not have any health facility.

Nawaj Ali, a villager, says when a person has fever, he or his family has to spend around Rs 1,000 on the transportation to reach the city area of Barmer to get medical treatment.

"In case of emergency, we have to rush patients to a health facility located at Barmer's city point to get him or her medical treatment, and this situation is a brisk business for transporters," he said. Barmer goes to polls on April 29. **PTI**

Giriraj booked for violating model code of conduct

Begusarai (Bihar): Union Minister Giriraj Singh was on Thursday booked for violating model code of conduct by making controversial remarks against the Muslim community at a rally here a day ago where BJP national president Amit Shah, among others, was present.

According to District Magistrate, Begusarai, Rahul Kumar, the FIR was lodged at Town police station under relevant sections of the Representation of People Act and the Indian Penal Code taking suo motu cognizance of the "controversial" remarks made by Singh at Wednesday rally.

Besides Shah, the rally was attended by a number of other BJP leaders, including Deputy Chief Minister Sushil Kumar Modi. Singh is contesting from Begusarai Lok Sabha as the NDA candidate and he is engaged in a three-cornered fight with CPI's Kanhaiya Kumar and RJD's Tanveer Hassan.

Video footage of Singh's brief address at the rally was telecast on news channels wherein he can be heard saying, "I would like to say, Giriraj Singh's ancestors died and were cremated. You need a yard of land even after you die, for burial of your mortal remains. If you say you cannot chant Vande Mataram, this nation will never forget you".

"There are many people who are trying to spread communal passions. We will not allow that to happen anywhere in Bihar including Begusarai. The RJD candidate in Darbhanga recently said he had problems with reciting Vande Mataram", Singh said referring to Abdul Bari Siddiqui's comments on Sunday last.

"In Begusarai too, many can be seen spewing venom wearing bade bhai ka kurta and chhoti bhai ka pyjama", he said referring to the long shirts and short trousers that are usually associated with devout Muslims. **PTI**

Amid fresh dissidence, HDK meets Cong leaders

Bengaluru: With dissidence in ruling coalition partner Congress surfacing again, Karnataka Chief Minister HD Kumaraswamy on Thursday took stock of the situation with his deputy G Parameshwara and senior Minister DK Shivakumar.

During the meeting, the Congress-JD(S) coalition leaders are said to have discussed about the threat by rebel Congress MLA Ramesh Jarkiholi to quit the party along with other legislators with him, and its implications on the Government.

The meeting also came in the backdrop of the BJP predicting the fall of the coalition Government after the Lok Sabha election results are declared on May 23.

Emerging out of the meeting with Chief Minister, who has taken a break after busy campaigning for about a month, Parameshwara ruled out any threat to the coalition Government.

"We have discussed politics also, but we also have information that there are no such developments (threatening the

Government)," the Congress leader told reporters.

"We don't have any apprehension about the collapse of the government as being claimed by the BJP," he said.

The government is stable, he asserted, adding they held discussions with the chief minister about facing drought situation in parts of the state.

Speculation about the longevity of the Congress-JD(S) coalition government in Karnataka has again come to the fore after the second and final phase of Lok Sabha polls in the state on Tuesday, with state BJP chief B S Yeddyurappa predicting its collapse after the election results.

There are talks within political circles that any adverse results for the coalition in the Lok Sabha polls will have its implications on the stability of the state government.

The Congress and JDS, which stitched an alliance after contesting the assembly elections separately last year, had an understanding for the Parliamentary polls despite resentment among the grass root workers and leaders of

both the parties.

Adding to this was the threat by Jarkiholi, who has been hobnobbing with the BJP for some time now and threatening he along with other MLAs would resign from Congress soon.

His public posturing has caused fear among the ruling coalition leaders as it could trigger the number game in the assembly.

Karnataka Pradesh Congress President Dinesh Gundu Rao, however expressed hope that Jarkiholi would think with "good sense" and not quit. Rao also warned of adverse consequence by believing in BJP.

"Congress has not done any injustice to him (Jarkiholi), party has always stood by him, he is five-time MLA from the party and has been a Minister.

"He too may not have any negative opinion against the party and is giving some statements due to some reasons, this is my feeling," he added. Rao, however, ruled out any talks with him and said May 23 Lok Sabha poll results will put an end to every thing. **PTI**

BJP is not politicising soldiers' valour, says Nirmala Sitharaman

Mumbai: Defence Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Thursday denied Opposition's allegation that the BJP was politicising security forces' valour to seek votes, saying her party was only talking about the "political will" necessary to combat terror.

"Who is politicising the (valour of) security forces? We haven't done it," she said, speaking to reporters here.

The UPA government led by Manmohan Singh lacked the political will to combat terrorism which was evident after the 26/11 Mumbai attack, the BJP leader said.

The Narendra Modi government took "decisive" steps and showed "political will" to combat terror, which was seen in the 2016 surgical strike and Balakot air strike in February in the aftermath of Uri and Pulwama attacks, respectively, Sitharaman said.

"The Congress feels hesitant to talk about political will, hence it thinks we are politicising (the valour of soldiers)," she said.

"We are not politicising the

valour, but talking about the political leadership's will to take action which is not politicisation," the defence minister said.

She also attacked the Congress over its poll promise to review the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, saying it would be difficult for the Army to operate in a state such as Jammu and Kashmir in its absence.

"For AFSPA to be removed, changes have to be brought on the ground first through programmes. Till that time, it cannot be removed," the minister said. Sitharaman also hit out at Opposition for questioning the Balakot air strike or seeking the proof of the surgical strike.

She felt "sad", she said, adding that Pakistan would like Opposition's language.

To a question, Sitharaman said due procedure was followed in negotiating the Rafale deal. There was no need to change the defence procurement policy in the context of the deal, which the Congress is criticising for alleged irregularities, she added. **PTI**

Bengaluru under security blanket after blasts in Lanka

Bengaluru: In the wake of the terror attacks in Sri Lanka, the police here on Thursday stepped up security and initiated elaborate measures to prevent such an incident.

In addition, the police have decided to set up an anti-terrorist cell in the city and have written to Karnataka Government in this regard.

As part of the measures, the police convened a meeting with head of various institutions, religious places and commercial establishments with a footfall of more than 500.

Speaking to reporters after the meeting, city police commissioner T Suneel Kumarsaid he has instructed deputy commissioners to gather information on religious places where lots of people congregate.

The deputy commissioners, in turn, have been directed to instruct the managers of malls and hotels. Further, the commissioner decided to hold a meeting with the trustees, board members and managers of religious institutions and commercial places. **PTI**

Those trying to tinker with Art 370 are playing with fire: Abdullah

Srinagar: National Conference chief Farooq Abdullah on Thursday said those who are trying to repeal articles 370 and 35-A of the Constitution, which guarantee special status to Jammu & Kashmir, are playing with fire.

"The need of the hour is to douse these flames and not to add fuel to the fire," Abdullah said, addressing a poll campaign rally at Devsar in Kulgam district.

The former Chief Minister asserted that no one can subdue Kashmiris.

"History bears the testimony to the fact that no one was able to enslave Kashmiris. We have fought Mughals, Pathans and other despotic regimes and never let anyone subdue us.

"New Delhi will have our respect, only if they respect the people of this State. No one should dare tinker with our self

esteem for the Kashmiris have always responded to the brickbats thrown at them with determination," he said.

Cautioning the people against forces inimical to the state's special status, Abdullah said the forces which have been inimical to the state's special status come in different hues and colors trying to destroy it.

"Kashmiris, however, have never allowed such forces to succeed in their nefarious designs; today the situation is no different. Today we see the BJP-RSS cheekily taking vows to destroy the identity and integrity of our State," he said.

He added that articles 370 and 35-A protect the state natives rights to jobs, land holdings and scholarships.

"Any move to scuttle the articles will have far reaching consequences on the people of the state. So it is imperative for

the people across the state, in particular the people of south Kashmir to vote. Every vote you cast will set the recourse of our State for the next half a decade," he added.

The former chief minister said the people of Kashmir can tackle their problems only through ballots and not guns.

"The problem cannot be resolved by using guns or pelting stones. It is only through the use of vote that the people of Kashmir can find a way forward.

"The gun culture has only added to the miseries of the people and made us susceptible to the machinations of those who are inimical to our identity. The people have to forge unity and come in large numbers to vote in order to save the identity, integrity, pluralistic visage and special constitutional status of our state," he said. **PTI**

India had shared actionable inputs with Sri Lanka before blasts, says Rajnath

Mumbai: Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh has said Indian authorities shared "actionable" intelligence with Sri Lanka before the serial blasts rocked the neighbouring country.

Nearly 360 people were killed in the Easter Sunday bombings in the island nation. "Desired and actionable inputs were shared with the authorities in Sri Lanka prior to the blasts. But unfortunately, they (plotters) succeeded," Singh told PTI.

Asked if Sri Lanka failed to act on those inputs, he said it is not a question of blaming that country's Government for it.

Nine suicide bombers, believed to be members of local Islamist extremist group named National Thowheed Jamath (NTJ), carried out the series of blasts that tore through three churches and three luxury hotels.

However, the NTJ has not

claimed responsibility for the attacks.

According to officials, intelligence inputs about a possible terror attack in Sri Lanka, targeting the Indian High Commission, were shared by Indian agencies with their counterparts in the island nation earlier this month after the National Investigation Agency completed its probe into an ISIS-inspired module planning to kill prominent leaders in south India.

The inputs were sent through diplomatic channels to Sri Lanka after a thorough investigation pertaining to the ISIS case in Coimbatore was carried out by the NIA, which has filed a charge sheet against seven people. During investigation, the probe team had stumbled upon videos of NTJ leader Zahran Hashim, which was indicative of a terror attack on the Indian High Commission in Colombo. **PTI**

LS polls over, Cong, BJP in Karna now focus on Assembly bypolls

Bengaluru: With polls ending for all 28 Lok Sabha constituencies in Karnataka, Congress and BJP turned their focus on Thursday on finalising candidates for Chincholi and Kundgol assembly constituencies for the May 19 by-elections.

BJP held its core committee meeting under the leadership of State chief B S Yeddyurappa to finalise its candidates for both the assembly segments.

Pradesh Congress President Dinesh Gundu Rao too held meetings to discuss the preparations for the by-election and selection of candidates.

Congress and JD(S) have decided to go to polls together by fielding a consensus candidate from the grand old party, as both seats were held by it.

The outcome of by-polls

along with Lok Sabha results is crucial for the ruling Congress-JD(S) alliance as it would have a bearing on the longevity of the coalition Government, triggering the number game in the Assembly.

Bypoll to Chincholi was necessitated as Umesh Jadhav quit as Congress MLA and joined the BJP to contest Lok Sabha polls from Gulbarga, while Kundgol seat fell vacant following the death of MLA and Minister C S Shivalli.

The last date to file nomination is on April 29.

Speaking to reporters after the core committee meeting Yeddyurappa said, "We have recommended one name each for both the constituencies to Delhi (party central leadership) after discussion.

It will be finalised tomorrow and from Delhi the candidates will be announced.

We will win both the seats and we are making all preparations."

"We also discussed prospects of Lok Sabha polls. According to our leaders and feedback received from various places we will win minimum 22 seats (out of 28). We have that confidence. We may win even more," he added. **PTI**

Mumbai: An electoral battleground for many political stalwarts

Mumbai: From Dalit icon Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar to noted Communist leader Sripad Dange, many a political stalwart have tried their luck in parliamentary elections from Mumbai.

There have also been surprises like when firebrand trade union leader George Fernandes trounced Congress heavy-weight S K Patil from the Mumbai South Lok Sabha constituency in 1967.

Before delimitation in 2008, the city district had three Lok Sabha constituencies - Mumbai South, South Central and North Central.



ed into Mumbai City and Mumbai Suburb in 1990.

In 1952, Mumbai's parliamentary constituencies were Mumbai South, Mumbai North and Mumbai Suburbs. While in 1957, there were Mumbai City South, Mumbai Central and

Mumbai North.

In 1962, the Lok Sabha seats were Mumbai City South, Mumbai City South Central and Mumbai City North Central (SC).

Ambedkar, who was the law minister in the Jawaharlal Nehru government formed after independence, contested as the candidate of the Scheduled Caste Federation (SCF) from Mumbai North in 1952.

However, the chief Constitution-maker was defeated by Congress candidate Narayan Kajrolkar. Kajrolkar had bagged 1,38,137 votes, while Ambedkar polled

1,23,576 votes.

In 1957, Defence Minister V K Krishna Menon of the Congress won from Mumbai North.

While Dange, a founding member of the Communist Party of India (CPI), was elected to the Lok Sabha from Mumbai Central in 1957, Fernandes emerged as a "giant killer" in 1967 by defeating Congress's Patil from Mumbai South.

Another interesting feature is that in 1971, Shiv Sena leader Manohar Joshi contested from Mumbai North Central but lost to R D Bhandare of the Congress.

In 1984, Joshi, who later went on to become the first Shiv Sena Chief Minister of Maharashtra, unsuccessfully contested as the BJP nominee against Sharad Dighe of the Congress from Mumbai North Central.

Another top Sena leader, Wamanrao Mahadik, had contested on a BJP ticket from Mumbai South Central in 1984.

Communist and socialist leaders have left their deep imprint on the political landscape of the financial capital of the country, which was once home to a large number of textile mills.

Communist stalwart

Ahilya Rangnekar was elected from Mumbai North Central in 1977 and Pramila Dandavate, the wife of former Union minister Madhu Dandavate, had made it to the Lok Sabha from the same constituency in 1980.

In 1984, trade unionist Datta Samant was elected to the Lower House of Parliament from Mumbai South-Central as an independent.

The metropolis now has half a dozen Lok Sabha seats — Mumbai North, Mumbai North-West, Mumbai North-East, Mumbai North-Central, Mumbai South-Central and Mumbai South — which go to the polls on April 29. **PTI**

Maruti to stop diesel vehicle sales from April 1, 2020

New Bharat Stage 6 emission norms will make small diesel engines unaffordable, says Chairman RC Bhargava

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

The country's largest car-maker Maruti-Suzuki today clearly announced that they will stop sales of all diesel-engined cars from April 1, 2020. This is the day that Bharat Stage 6 (BS6) emission norms come into force in India and no old Bharat Stage 4 diesel engined vehicles will be allowed to be registered. During the car-makers annual results conference, Chairman R C Bhargava made this unequivocal statement about diesels and announced that this would apply to all Maruti-Suzuki products including hatchbacks, sedans, SUV's and commercial vehicles. Bhargava said that this was because making existing diesel engines BS6 compatible was not technically possible and new engines and costs for a BS6 diesel option on smaller cars would add at least ₹1 lakh to the existing cost of a diesel car. He felt that alongside factors such as higher cost and the fact that

diesel vehicles will be deregistered in the National Capital Region within ten years, a plan which might be implemented nationwide and with diesel prices rising, the demand for diesel vehicles would collapse. "The Supreme Court has made it clear that it will not allow the sale and registration of any BS4 from April 1, 2020", Bhargava said explaining this decision.

This had a negative impact on the Maruti's share price which crashed after this announcement after having climbed earlier after the company beat investor expectations with a relatively positive

Bhargava expressed negativity on the possibility of more electric vehicles being launched in the small car space given costs and without a comprehensive study on commodities and carbon costs.

Unit sales for the year climbed to 1,862,449 units including exports, a growth of 4.7 per cent and thus net sales stood at ₹83,026.5 crore a growth of 6.3 per cent. However with foreign exchange volatility and rising commodity prices, net profit declined 2.9 per cent to ₹7500 crore, and thus the company only declared a dividend of ₹80 per



result. This is because 23 per cent of Maruti's sales are of diesel vehicles, almost all are of the 1.3 litre diesel engine that Maruti licenses from Fiat, and the company recently announced a new 1.5 litre diesel engine for the Ciaz sedan. Bhargava however said that the company continued to work on hybrid vehicles and while no 'strong hybrids' will be launched in the coming year, Maruti-Suzuki continues to work on the technology for a potential future launch.

share. One other reason for declining profitability were the increase in customer discounts which rose from ₹15,849 per vehicle on average in 2017-18 to ₹18,277 per vehicle in 2018-19. The company also said that while the last few quarters have been weak, sales in the fourth quarter declining 0.7 per cent over the previous year this was in line with most pre-election years in India. That said, Maruti-Suzuki expected sales to grow between 4-8 per cent in Fiscal Year 2020.

Internet users in India to rise by 40% by 2023: McKinsey

With data costs falling by 95 per cent since 2013, India will see internet users rise by about 40 per cent and number of smartphones to double by 2023, McKinsey said in a report.

It also expects core digital sectors to jump two-fold to \$355-435 billion by 2025. The report 'Digital India - Technology to Transform a Connection Nation' by McKinsey Global Institute said the country is one of the largest and fastest-growing markets for digital consumers, with 560 million internet subscribers in 2018, second only to China.

Indian mobile data users consume 8.3 gigabits (GB) of data each month on average, compared with 5.5 GB for mobile users in China and 8-8.5 GB in advanced digital economy of South Korea. Indians have 1.2 billion mobile phone subscriptions and downloaded more apps - 12.3 billion in 2018 - than residents of any other country except China.

"Our analysis of 17 mature and emerging economies finds India is digitising faster than any other country in the study, save Indonesia - and there is plenty of room to grow: just over 40 per cent of the populace has an internet subscription," it said.

While a Government push has helped digitise the economy, private sector firms such as Reliance Jio has helped bring down data costs by more than 95 per cent since 2013, it said, adding the cost of one gigabyte fell from 9.8 per cent of per capita monthly GDP in 2013 (roughly \$12.45) to 0.37 per cent in 2017 (the equivalent of a few cents).

"Private-sector innovation has helped bring internet-enabled services to millions of consumers and made online usage more accessible. For example, Reliance Jio's strategy of bundling virtually free smartphones with subscriptions to its mobile service has spurred innovation and competitive pricing across the sector," the report said.

As a result, monthly mobile data consumption per user is growing at 152 per cent annually - more than twice the rates in the United States and China. Average fixed-line download speed quadrupled between 2014 and 2017.

"India will increase the number of internet users by about 40 per cent to between 750 million and 800 million and double the number of smartphones to between 650 million and 700 million by 2023," it said, adding the potential for India's internet subscriber base could reach 835 million by 2023. McKinsey said India's

internet user base has grown rapidly in recent years, propelled by the decreasing cost and increasing availability of smartphones and high-speed connectivity, and is now one of the largest in the world.

The average Indian social media user spends 17 hours on the platforms each week, more than social media users in China and the United States.

The share of Indian adults with at least one digital financial account has more than doubled since 2011, to 80 per cent, thanks in large part to the more than 332 million people who opened mobile phone-based accounts under the Government's Jan-Dhan Yojana - a mass financial-inclusion programme.

"By many measures, India is on its way to becoming a digitally advanced nation," McKinsey said. "Just over 40 per cent of the populace has an internet subscription, but India is already home to one of the world's largest and most rapidly growing bases of digital consumers. It is digitising activities at a faster pace than many mature and emerging economies."

India's core digital sectors, comprising of IT-BPM, digital communication services and electronics manufacturing, accounted for about ₹170 billion - or 7 per cent - of GDP in 2017-18.

Govt extends deadline for firms to submit photo, other details about registered offices

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Companies have been given more time to furnish photographs and location details of their registered offices to the Corporate Affairs Ministry, with the deadline being extended to June 15.

In February, the Ministry notified a new electronic form ACTIVE-1 (Active Company Tagging Identities and Verification). It was part of larger efforts to curb shell companies, suspected to be used as conduits for illicit fund flows.

The deadline for submitting the form with requisite details was April 25. It is applicable for companies incorporated on or before December 31, 2017.

The ministry has now extended the deadline till June 15. In case of non-submission of the form within the deadline, companies concerned would have to pay a late fee of Rs 10,000, according to a notification issued on Thursday.

Among other details, a company has to provide the photograph of its registered office with at least one director or key managerial personnel who is signing the form.

Bank credit rose by 14.19 per cent to ₹96.45 lakh crore while deposits grew 10.60 per cent to ₹125.30 lakh crore in the first fortnight ended on April 12, according to recent RBI data.

In the year ago fortnight, deposits were at ₹113.29 lakh crore and advances stood at ₹84.46 lakh crore.

In the fiscal ended March 2019, bank credit had risen by 13.24 per cent and deposits grew by 10.03 per cent. This was the second consecutive double-digits credit growth after the same had declined to 4.54 per cent in FY17 at ₹78.41 lakh crore, which was the lowest since 1963, the RBI data said.

On a year-on-year basis, non-food bank credit increased by 13.2 per cent in February 2019 as compared with an

increase of 9.8 per cent in the year ago period.

Loans to the services sector almost doubled with a 23.7 per cent growth in February compared to 14.2 per cent in the same month last year.

Advances to agriculture and allied activities increased by 7.5 per cent in February compared to an increase of 9 per cent in February 2018.

Credit to the industry rose by 5.6 per cent in February, up from an increase of 1 per cent in February 2018.

Credit to the infrastructure, chemical and chemical products, and all engineering sectors accelerated. However, credit growth to basic metal & metal products, textiles, and food processing decelerated/contracted.

Personal loans rose 16.7 per cent in February down from 20.4 per cent in February 2018, the RBI said.

India's crude oil production drops 4% in FY19

The country's crude oil production fell over 4 per cent in the financial year 2018-19 after aging fields of state-owned Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) and Oil India Ltd (OIL) missed the target, official data showed Thursday.

India produced 34.2 million tonne of crude oil in the fiscal year ended March 31, down from 35.7 million tonne in the previous year, according to data released by the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas here.

ONGC output dropped to 21 million tonne from 22.25 million tonne in 2017-18, while OIL saw a 2.5 per cent dip to 3.3 million tonne.

Fields in the private sector saw a production drop of nearly 2 per cent to 9.8 million tonne mainly because of lower output at Cairn India's Rajasthan oilfield.

ONGC production was lower due to technical issues at its Mumbai and Neelam Heera fields in the Arabian Sea

and less than the production at Santhal and Balol fields in Gujarat.

During March, the country's total crude oil production fell to 2.85 million tonne from 3.04 million tonne in the corresponding month of the previous fiscal year.

Natural gas production, however, edged up to 32.9 billion cubic metre (BCM) in 2018-19, from 32.6 BCM in the previous year as ONGC produced 5.3 per cent more gas at 24.67 BCM.

Higher production by ONGC made up for a nearly 14 per cent drop in output from private sector fields at 5.47 BCM.

This was a result of shutting down of two more wells at Reliance Industries' eastern offshore D1-D3 gas fields in the flagging KG-D6 block, the ministry statement said.

Indian refineries produced 2 per cent higher fuel and other petroleum products at 257.2 million tonne in 2018-19 on a better showing by state-owned firms.

BLASTS IN SRILANKA Suicide bomber was earlier arrested but released

One of the Sri Lankan suicide bombers was previously arrested by police and then released, a senior Government official said on Thursday.

Iham Ahmed Ibrahim, one of two sons of a spice tycoon who blew himself up in Sunday's attacks, detonated a device at the Cinnamon Grand hotel in Colombo on Easter Sunday, the official told CNN.

"It was the suicide bomber of the Cinnamon Grand bomb attack who was released earlier," the official said.

Iham Ahmed Ibrahim and his brother Imsath Ahmed Ibrahim were previously identified as two of the suicide bombers in Sunday's attacks which left at least 359 people dead.

Police have confirmed to CNN that they are holding the brothers' father, Mohamed Yusuf Ibrahim, a wealthy spice trader, on suspicion of aiding and abetting his sons.

Sri Lankan authorities have blamed a local Muslim group for the bloodbath although the Islamic State has claimed responsibility for the suicide bombings.

Lanka intensifies crackdown on terror suspects

16 more held

The Sri Lankan authorities on Thursday intensified their raids with the help of the army and arrested 16 more suspects in connection with the country's worst terror attack on Easter Sunday that killed nearly 360 people and left over 500 injured.

The arrested people were being interrogated at length by the investigation sleuths in connection with the bombings.

Nine suicide bombers, believed to be the members of a local Islamist extremist group National Thowheed Jamath (NTJ), carried out a series of devastating blasts that tore through three churches and three luxury hotels.

Officials said with the arrest of 16 more people on Wednesday, the total number of suspects under police custody has risen to 76.

Many of the arrested people have suspected links to the NTJ, the group blamed for the bombings. However, the NTJ has not claimed responsibility for the attacks.

ISIS has claimed responsibility for the attacks and identified suicide bombers who carried out the devastating blasts. Authorities have deployed thousands of troops to help police carry out search operations.

Over 5,000 Army personnel have been deployed around the country. "During the last 24 hours, there have been no major incidents. We have deployed over 6,300 troops. This includes 1,000 from the Airforce and 600 from the Navy," military spokesman Brigadier Sumith Atapattu said.

Meanwhile, a minor explosion happened behind the magistrate's court at Pugoda, the western province town, 40 kms north of Colombo. There was no immediate report of any casualty. Police said that the explosion occurred in a garbage dump and that there were no injuries. A probe has been launched to ascertain the cause.

Search operations of suspected properties, arrests and detention of people and to place road blocks for such operations have been facilitated by the newly-enforced emergency regulations.

The regulations were adopted without a vote in Parliament on Wednesday. The curfew which was imposed at 10 pm on Wednesday was lifted at 4 am on Thursday.

President Maithripala Sirisena has convened an all-party meeting. He would meet religious leaders. Both parleys are to discuss the attacks dubbed as among the five deadliest terrorist attacks carried out since the 9/11 in the US. Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith, the head of the local catholic church, has asked all churches to stop masses until the situation improved, his office said.

On Wednesday, the Sri Lankan Government had admitted that "major" intelligence lapses led to the horrific coordinated attacks.

Sir Lanka Defence Secretary resigns

Colombo: Sri Lanka's Defence Secretary Hemasiri Fernando resigned from his post on Thursday, days after a series of devastating suicide attacks that tore through three churches and three luxury hotels on Easter Sunday.

President Maithripala Sirisena had asked Defence Secretary Fernando and Inspector General of Police Pujith Jayasundara to quit after their failure to prevent the blasts despite having prior intelligence.

Fernando handed over his resignation letter on Thursday on a request made by President Sirisena, Colombo Gazette reported.

Scared Muslim refugees flee homes over attack fears

Hundreds of Muslim refugees in western Sri Lanka have taken refuge in mosques and a police station after facing intimidation following the deadly Easter bombings, activists said on Thursday.

At least 359 people died in Sunday's coordinated suicide blasts, including more than 100 Christians attending mass at St

Sebastian's church in Negombo on the island's west coast. The attacks have been condemned by leaders of the country's Muslim minority, but the community has been left in fear of a backlash.

Scores of Ahmadi Muslims who settled in Negombo after fleeing persecution in their home countries have been thrown out of their accommodation by landlords, according to officials. "Today these

refugees have become refugees again in Sri Lanka. They have been displaced for a second time," Ruki Fernando of Inform, a Sri Lankan human rights group, told reporters.

The refugees are from Pakistan, Afghanistan, Yemen and Iran. Ahmadihs have faced repeated attacks in these countries by hardline Islamist groups who do not consider them to be Muslim.

LANKA SUSPENDS VISAS ON ARRIVAL PROGRAMME
Sri Lanka suspended its plans to grant visas on arrival to citizens of 39 countries. "Although arrangements were in place to issue visas on arrival for citizens of 39 countries, we have now decided to hold it for the time being in consideration of the current security situation," Tourism Minister John Amararatunga said.

LEAVE SL OVER 'CONCRETE THREAT': ISRAEL TO CITIZENS
Israel on Thursday urged its citizens travelling in Sri Lanka to leave the country, citing an "elevated concrete threat" following deadly Easter bombings there. The recommendation from Israel's counter-terrorism bureau said the travel warning was issued after consultations with security and foreign ministry officials.

1 OF SUICIDE BOMBERS HAD OZ VISA: PM MORRISON
Australia's Prime Minister Scott Morrison said one of the suicide bombers had been in Australia years earlier. Prime Minister Morrison said the person had been in Australia on a student and a graduate skilled visa with a spouse and child visa as well. The individual left in early 2013.

DRONES, UNMANNED AIRCRAFT BANNED AFTER BOMBINGS
Sri Lanka has banned the use of drones and unmanned aircraft following the massive Easter Sunday. The Civil Aviation Authority said the ban will be in effect until further notice. The use of drones and unmanned aircraft has been temporarily banned within the Sri Lankan airspace, Colombo Gazette reported.

LANKA STILL FACES POSSIBLE TERROR ATTACKS: PM
Sri Lanka still faced more attacks and authorities were now targeting "sleepers" — terrorists who could activate to initiate another round of bombings, Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe warned. Facing public criticism for not acting against Islamist extremist groups in the island nation, Wickremesinghe said some of the suspected attackers responsible for the Easter Sunday bombings were being monitored by the country's intelligence services.

Washington: Former Vice-President Joe Biden formally joined the crowded Democratic presidential contest on Thursday, declaring the soul of the nation at stake if President Donald Trump wins re-election.

In a video posted on Twitter, Biden focused on the 2017 deadly clash between white supremacists and counter protesters in Charlottesville, Virginia. Biden noted Trump's comments that there were some "very fine people" on both sides of the violent encounter, which left one woman dead.

"We are in the battle for the soul of this nation," Biden said. "If we give Donald Trump eight years in the White House, he will forever and fundamentally alter the character of this nation — who we are. And I cannot stand by and watch that happen." The 76-year-old Biden becomes an instant front-runner alongside Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders, who is leading many polls and has proved to be a successful fundraiser.

Among Democrats, Biden has unmatched international and legislative experience, and he is among the best-known faces in US politics. He quickly racked up endorsements on Thursday morning, becoming the first Democrat running for president with the backing of more than one US senator.

Still, Biden must compete in a field that now spans at least 20 Democrats and has been celebrated for its racial and gender diversity.

Trump questions Biden's intelligence to wage winning primary bid

Washington: US President Donald Trump on Thursday cast doubt on Joe Biden's mental capacity for a successful primary campaign as the seasoned Democrat became the latest to join the 2020 race for the White House.

CHINA VISIT WILL TAKE TIES TO NEW HEIGHTS: PAK PM

Islamabad: Prime Minister Imran Khan on Thursday called China an "iron brother" of Pakistan and said his visit to Beijing for the 2nd Belt and Road Forum (BRF) will take bilateral strategic ties to new heights.

N KOREA READY ONLY IF IT GETS GUARANTEES: PUTIN

Vladivostok: Russian President Vladimir Putin said North Korean leader Kim Jong Un confirmed during his first summit Thursday he is willing to give up his nuclear weapons — but only if he gets an ironclad guarantee of security beforehand. The Russian President stressed that Moscow and Washington both want North Korea to abandon its nuclear weapons. But he said the security guarantees should be underwritten by multiple countries, hinting at an arrangement like the six-nation talks Russia participated in until their collapse in 2009.

ASTEROID IMPACT: NASA TO CONDUCT 'MOCK DRILL'

Washington: NASA, along with its international partners, is set to conduct a mock exercise that will play out a realistic — but fictional — scenario for an asteroid on an impact trajectory with Earth. The exercise will help the planetary defense community understand the important aspects of a possible disaster and identify issues for accomplishing a successful response.

HK RIGHTS MUST BE 'FULLY RESPECTED': BRITAIN

London: Free speech and Assembly rights in Hong Kong must be "fully respected", Britain said on Thursday, a day after leaders of the city's democracy movement were jailed for organising mass protests in 2014. Under-fire skipper Dinesh Karthik silenced his critics with a career-best 97 not out as Kolkata Knight Riders recovered from an atrocious start to post a competitive 175 for six against Rajasthan Royals in their must-win IPL fixture here on Thursday.

Under pressure to perform after a string of five straight defeats, the World Cup-bound Karthik promoted himself to No 4, shrugging off criticism, and smashed nine sixes and seven fours in his 50-ball unbeaten knock, as KKR hit top gear in the back end of the innings, scoring 126 from the last 10 overs and 75 off the last five overs.

Karthik seized the

momentum in the 11th over when he hit Shreyas Gopal for a six followed by three boundaries in an over that yielded 25 runs and KKR did not look back since then. Karthik completed his fifty from 35 balls and smashed Jofra Archer for successive sixes in the penultimate over before bettering his previous best of 86 when he went berserk against Unadkat by hitting him for two sixes and one four in the final over.

Unadkat conceded 50 runs for his one wicket and was the most expensive of the lot as he undid all the good work done by Varun Aaron (2/20) who had a fine new ball spell of 3-1-10-2. Put in to bat, KKR got off to an atrocious start to be 32/2 in powerplay overs against an all out pace attack from Rajasthan Royals. The injury-prone pacer had returned to the IPL after a gap of two years and straight away contributed to team's winning cause by picking up four wickets in two games — against Kolkata Knight Riders and Chennai Super Kings.

"His presence has helped the team immensely and we are very thankful for the inspiration and passion that he brought to the squad. The team will deeply miss his energy and presence around. We wish him a speedy recovery and all the luck for all future endeavours," RCB Chairman said.

With the ODI World Cup scheduled to start on May 30 in UK, Steyn may not be willing to aggravate his injury.

Saina, Sindhu sail into quarters

The other Indian in fray, Sindhu, seeded fourth, took just 33 minutes to beat Indonesia's Choirunnisa 21-15, 21-19 in another second round women's singles match.

The world number six will next play the unseeded Kai Yanyan of China in the quarter-finals.

Besides the female duo, Sameer Verma too continued his impressive run by progressing to the men's singles quarter-finals. Sameer brushed aside Hong Kong's Ng Ka Long Angus 21-12, 21-19 in his second round encounter.

But a Herculean task awaits Sameer in the last eight round as he will clash with second seed Shi Yuqi of China.

Among other Indians, mixed doubles pair of Utkarsh Arora and Karishma Wadkar crashed out in the second round after losing 21-10, 21-15 to Hafiz Faizal and Gloria Emanuelle Widjaja of Indonesia.

India's young brigade dominates mixed team competitions in shooting WC

Young Indian shooters dominated the mixed team competitions by winning two Gold medals on day three of the ongoing ISSF World Cup to take the country on the top of medal tally here on Thursday.

The teenage pairing of Manu Bhaker and Saurabh Chaudhary won their second Gold in 10m Air Pistol Mixed Team event in as many World Cup stages this year while another teenager Divyansh Panwar struck Gold in Air Rifle Mixed Team event partnering the more accomplished Anjum Moudgil to help cap a memorable day for India.

The start of the day was all about a new pair, a new format

and a new result. Anjum partnered Divyansh, who was in only his second senior competition, for the first time to beat the formidable Chinese pair of Liu Ruxuan and Yang Haoran 17-15 in a pulsating Gold medal match.

The win was even more creditable given that a new format was being tried by the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) for the mixed events in Beijing.

The second Indian team in the event, Apurvi Chandela and Deepak Kumar also reached the finals but finished sixth eventually.

Then came the icing on the cake with Manu and Saurabh's vic-

tory in the 10m Air Pistol Mixed Team event. The teenage stars comprehensively defeated yet another Chinese pair consisting of former Olympic champion Pang Wei and 2019 New Delhi World Cup finalist Jiang Ranxin, 16-6 in the Gold medal match.

Manu and Saurabh began from where they had left at the home World Cup in Delhi a couple of months back, beating top class opponents en route to the Gold. They did enough to make it to the final eight and then beat an experienced German pair in the quarter-finals, a second Chinese pair in the semifinals, before comprehensively beating Pang and Jiang 16-6 in the Gold medal match.

The new format entailed the top eight teams qualifying for the final round where four quarterfinals, two semifinals and a final would determine the eventual medalists.

The quarterfinal was a 30-shot match-up between pairs in rifle while it was a 40-shot affair in pistol. The medal events would entail a series of single shots per competitor per team.

To decide the medals, the pair with the higher series aggregate would be allotted two points and the first team to reach 16 points would be adjudged the winner.

In the Air Rifle event, a single shot would start the final before the series of two shots kicked in.

KAKRAN, MANJU HAND TWIN BRONZE

India's Divya Kakran and Manju Kumari bagged Bronze medals for the country in the women's competition of the Asian Wrestling Championships here on Thursday.

Asian Games Bronze-medallist Kakran defeated Battsetseg Soronzonbold of Mongolia via fall in the play-offs of the 68kg category to finish on the podium.

It was double delight for India as Manju also secured a Bronze medal earlier in the day by beating Vietnam's Thi Huong Dao 11-2.

Seema, who also made it to the play-offs, however failed to register a hat-trick of Bonze medals for India after losing to Valentina Ivanovna Islamova Brik of Kazakhstan 5-11 in the 50kg category.

Silver-medallist in the 69kg category at the 2017 edition of the Asian Championships, Kakran lost out on a place in the final of 68kg after going down to Feng Zhou of China 4-14 in the semifinals.

In the 59kg category, Manju had lost to Battsetseg Altantsetseg of Mongolia 6-15 in the last four stage to settle for a place in the bronze-medal round.

Manju had earlier beaten Kazakhstan's

Madina Bakbergenova 5-3 in the quarter-finals.

In the 50kg category, Seema defeated Meng Hsuan Hsieh of Chinese Taipei 10-2 in her repechage bout. She had earlier lost to Yuki Irie of Japan in the qualification round but made the repechage after her Japanese rival reached the final.

However, India's campaign got over early in the 55kg and 76kg weight divisions when Lalita and Pooja lost their respective quarterfinal bouts to bow out of the event.

Lords of the Ring: 6 Indians enter Finals

Amit Panghal (52kg) and Kavinder Singh Bisht (56kg) remained on course for their second successive international Gold medals this year and India looked good to notch up its best ever performance in the Asian Boxing Championships here on Thursday.

Panghal and Bisht were the most impressive on a day when Shiva Thapa's (60kg) unprecedented fourth successive semifinal appearance ended with a Bronze after a gruelling battle which could have gone either way.

Deepak Singh (49kg) and Ashish Kumar (75kg) joined Panghal and Bisht in the men's finals, while Pooja Rani (81kg) and Simranjit Kaur (64kg) advanced to Friday's summit clashes in the women's draw.

Panghal defeated China's Hu Jianguan in a split verdict, which was a surprise given that the Indian was clearly the more dominant of the two boxers and dictated the bout with his tremendous pace and aggression.

Bisht, on the other hand, turned in a lion-hearted show in a bloody battle which left him and his opponent — Mongolian Enkh-Amar Khakhuu — with bandaged right eyes. The draining fight ended 3-2 in the Indian's favour.

Thapa came out all guns blazing too, against 2015 edition's Silver-medallist

Kazakhstan's Zakir Safiullin, but a loss of momentum in the final round ended up tilting the scales against him in a split decision by the judges.

Also finishing with a Bronze among men were Ashish (69kg) and Satish Kumar (+91kg).

Settling for Bronze medals among the women were veteran former champion L Sarita Devi (60kg), last edition's Silver-medallist Manisha (54kg), former junior world champion Nikhat Zareen (51kg) and world Silver-medallist Sonia Chahal (57kg).

Manisha lost to Taiwan's Huang Hsiao-Wen, while Sarita (60kg) went down to China's Yang Wenlu.

Pooja was up against Kazakhstan's Fariza Sholtay and emerged triumphant in a unanimous decision.

Zareen gave it her all in the clash against Vietnam's Nguyen Thi Tam but signed off with a Bronze after losing the bout on a split verdict by the judges.

Sonia was squared off against local favourite Nilwan Techasuep and although the Indian seemed to be a more precise puncher than her rival, the judges ruled in the Tha's favour much to the crowd's delight.

In the last Indian bout of the day, national champion Simranjit faced a rather sluggish opponent in Uzbekistan's Maftunakhon Melieva and controlled the proceedings from start to finish for an easy 5-0 triumph.

Living with electricity

Spending a week with an electric car can change one's outlook towards such vehicles but upfront costs are an issue

At the outset, I should make one thing clear that the BMW i3s is a luxury car, it might be an eco-friendly BMW with recycled plastic being used as well as environmental-friendly fabric for the seat and the few bits of (fake) leather were offcuts from the production line, but this is a BMW nonetheless. This is therefore, not a car for everyone, but is one of the most popular electric vehicles in Europe. Priced at around 40,000 Euros, if it were to come to India, if incentives are offered for the import of electric vehicles, such as no additional excise, it will still cost at least ₹35 lakh, only a bit less than a brand-new BMW 3-series or X1. However, driving one for a week, complete with its new green registration plates that electric vehicles are allowed to use was an eye-opener for this writer.

To be fair, this column had been written about the i3s when we had driven it in Portugal a year and half ago, but that was a media drive where one did not have to deal with the nitty-gritty of living with an electric vehicle, that is charging. Now, we know that India does not have enough charging infrastructure as yet, and more on that later. But I could charge the i3s at home, thanks to a couple of reasons. Firstly, I had covered parking and a plug-point as well as a three-phase power connection. While charging from a low amperage point meant that the car took over twelve hours to charge from empty and on 'Comfort' mode it took twelve hours.

In 'Comfort' mode, the default mode of the car had 218 kilometers of range on full charge. On 'Eco Pro' mode, the car had around 250 kilometers of range and in 'Eco Pro+' over 300 kilometres of range. I, however, kept the car on 'Comfort' most of the time as it allowed me to use the air-conditioner without any issues, it is summer in Delhi after all. I'd also plugged in my mobile phone so as to listen to music and actual range was a lot higher than the initial indicated one because the i3s has a very good regenerating system that charges the battery whenever you lift your foot off the pedal so much so that you rarely end up using the brakes.

So what are the headline numbers. The car claimed that it was consuming 12.9 kilowatt-hours (units) of electricity for every 100 kilometers of driving. Now, in Delhi, residential power costs ₹7.75 per unit at maximum rates, this means that the i3s has a running cost, if you buy power at the peak rate, of just ₹1 per km. That, frankly, is unbeatable by any petrol or diesel car. Keep in mind that fixed costs remain the same, any few



households fall into the peak charge for electricity. So overall costs will, using a back of the envelope calculation, be around 80 paise per kilometre. A small petrol hatchback such as the Hyundai i20 or Suzuki Baleno would have a per-kilometre cost of ₹5.5. Even with BMW's 1,00,000 kilometre warranty on the battery and rising fuel prices going forward, which is almost certain, savings on running cost over that period will be ₹8 lakh at best, not enough to make up the difference. Maybe if you considered this over a BMW X1 for example, you might save money but that is all dependent on a benevolent government which wants to promote electric car usage in India and keeps import duties low or at zero at least

initially to seed the market. But this does not preclude the fact that the i3s will, even if not charged import duties, cost 3.5 times that of a standard hatchback. And then there is an issue with infrastructure, there are some charging stations built in and around Delhi by Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL) for the fleet of government electric vehicles, including one at Jor Bagh Market near the offices of the Environment Ministry. But guess what, that charging system is not compatible with that of the BMW. This is like needing an iPhone charger and finding a Micro-USB charger. So well, I could not try that out. This incompatibility issue is something that the industry and govern-

ment will need to deal with. The i3s is actually an amazing car to drive around the city. For one the instant power delivery and almost perfectly linear acceleration means that it overtakes with surprising ease, it can be rather quick if you want it to be and thanks to its excellent centre-of-gravity, it handles like you expect a BMW should. But this is just a technology-demonstrator brought here by BMW to showcase their technology and train their service engineers. However, I do wish that the car-maker does share this car with someone in the government and let them drive around and get some idea of how to formulate electric vehicle policy going forward.



Chinese artist writes book using only emoticons

Book from the Ground is a novel written using only emoticons by a Chinese artist Xu Bing that illustrates the ability to create a universal language using graphic symbols, he said.

Xu's aim to create the book, which so far has only been published in the US, is for any person anywhere in the world to be able to understand the story without having to know any given language in advance, since the emoticon symbols are universally shared and used. This preoccupation with language, which permeates all of Xu's work, stems from his childhood. When he was 11, the Cultural Revolution erupted in China and he had to learn new, simplified Chinese characters in order to be able to read and write according to the government's new guidelines.

"It's the first book that everyone in the world can read, since it needs no translation," said the artist, adding that currently, by using a very simple system of signs, emoticon users, especially young people, enjoy the ability "to communicate on the international level." "The idea for the book began 13 years ago, when I was having exhibitions all over the world and I spent a lot of time on airports," said Xu.

The book includes 24 chapters. Xu presented his new book at the Art for People exposition, where on display is a banner given to him by the Museum of Modern Art in 1999 on which can be read the slogan "Art for the People" with the English letters grouped in a way that simulates Chinese writing.

Using the same calligraphic technique, the artist has also adapted or translated the 15th century poem *El bon poble* by Ausias March in a work inspired by the Valencian culture. —IANS

Trick or treat

There are certain skills that make life easier. Here are six shortcuts that every cook should know to make things trouble-free in the kitchen

There are certain small skills that make life better and easier. I'm well aware that many of them take place outside of the kitchen, and I probably don't know as many of those as I should. I'm of no use if you have a flat tire or need to calculate the circumference of something or want to find your way out of the woods.

But after many years of clanking around in the kitchen, I have collected a fair arsenal of cooking tips and shortcuts. Here are a few that everyone should know:

HOW TO QUICKLY RIPEN AVOCADOS

If you have a hard avocado and you need it to be soft in a day or so, simply place it in a brown paper bag with a banana or apple and fold the top to close it up. The natural ethylene gases emitted by the other fruit will cause the avocado to ripen faster. Depending on how hard your avocado is, it might take a couple of days.

HOW TO MINCE GARLIC SUPER FINE

If you are using minced garlic in a dish, particularly where the garlic is uncooked, big chunks are not what you are looking for. Just smash a clove or two (or five) with the side of a

heavy knife, slip off the papery skin and start chopping on a cutting board. As the garlic gets chopped, add a pinch or so of kosher or sea salt and keep chopping. The salt acts as an abrasive so the garlic gets minced fine. Every once in a while, use the side of the knife to smear the garlic against the cutting board, then scrape it back up and keep mincing. You can hear the salt crunching under the blade as it works to pulverise the garlic.

HOW TO MAKE BUTTERMILK

Unless we are really planning ahead, when 'buttermilk' comes up as an ingredient in a recipe, it's unlikely most of us have it on hand. Easy solution — Make your own. Place one tablespoon lemon juice or white vinegar in a measuring cup and then fill it with milk to the one cup line. I like to use whole milk, but you can also use 2 per cent. If you see slight curdling, don't worry it won't affect the finished product. This may not be as thick as regular buttermilk, but the acidity in the milk will perform the same function — getting you to a tender, flaky and flavorful baked good.

HOW TO PEEL GINGER WITH A SPOON

Ginger's skin is thin enough



to be scraped off with the edge of a teaspoon. In fact, it's easier to use a spoon than a vegetable peeler because the spoon can get into the crevices and navigate over the bumps more easily. Also, this means you can have even a little kid help with this kitchen task, since they can't nick themselves with a spoon.

HOW TO SOFTEN BROWN SUGAR

If you have a day or two, just place a piece of fresh bread in a container with the brown sugar, seal the container and your brown sugar will soften right up. If you are in a hurry, place the brown sugar in a bowl, place a damp paper towel over it, cover the bowl with a plate and microwave it for 20 seconds. Check to see if it's soft and if not, continue microwaving in 20 second bursts until it is. Use it pretty quickly, and when you store any leftovers, make sure to put a piece of fresh bread in the container with the sugar.

HOW TO GET HONEY (OR MOLASSES, MAPLE SYRUP OR CORN SYRUP) OUT OF A MEASURING CUP

Anything sticky is just plain hard to measure. You pour it into the cup or spoon and then into your bowl or pot, and a thick coating is always left inside the measuring cup, drip-drip-dripping, but never fully getting out of the cup. The quick hack is cooking spray. Just spray the inside of the cup or measuring spoon with non-stick cooking spray, measure your sticky ingredient and it will slide right out. Cleanup is easier, too.

CHEF TALK

'AWARENESS IS THE KEY'

Chef TARUN SIBAL tells AYUSHI SHARMA that our lifestyle choices are the exact opposite of what's required for a healthy body. The change needs to start with the use of local, seasonal produce and by restricting the intake of processed food options

Given livestock, certain foods won't last beyond 2030-50 as predicted by Lancet, how do we change food culture to make sustainable choices?

This situation has become alarming. We need to go back to the consumption of local produce. The focus on westernised diets which are based on three crop varieties and an overconsumption of meat needs to be tackled. Refined sugars, saturated fats, dairy are areas where the restrictive approach can work in our favour. We will also need to inhibit wastefulness as a habit.

What are the challenges to a sustainable food culture in India?

The sheer size and diversity of the country presents a huge challenge in terms of food. Indian food culture is an amalgamation of varied food interpretations. Sustainable culture will need education for the farmer and evolution of the consumer at various levels of the economy.

In what way do we need to change the way we eat, given our lifestyle choices?

It can only start with the understanding that we need to make a change, so awareness is the key. Our lifestyle choices are the exact opposite of what's required for a healthy body and mind. Hence the intake becomes the most important aspect we can work on. As I said, it will start with the use of local and seasonal produce. And by restricting the intake of processed food options.

As the population grows and yields get squeezed, a growing number of farmers are switching to practices that conserve resources and at the same time are more productive. What do you have to say about the native crops that India has stopped growing?

It's a shame that we end up lapping what the West brings us with respect to super foods. We have always had abundance in terms of produce that is good for you. From ghee to barley, millet to coconut, moringa to rosella. We have it all. We need to make all of this mainstream and enhance its usage. We also have to create suitable demand and maintain a healthy rate of supply.

What do you have to say about the current food culture in India?

We have a head start when it comes to sustainable food culture as a major chunk of the Indian population is vegetarian. By focusing on grains, legume, pulses, vegetables and fruits, the balance



of the food ecosystem is maintained. But with an increase in the urban population that centres around a western diet, this balance is shifting.

Has Indian cuisine made a mark on the global palate? Is it being appreciated by connoisseurs and the masses adequately?

You will be surprised if I tell you that Indian cuisine is classified as a heritage one by the UN, with Mexico and China being the other two countries with the same status. We have been eating the same for ages. Indian cuisine is a feast as it's rich, varied, seasonal and has all the elements that ensure that it is appreciated across the globe. International chefs have opened up to Indian cuisine and Indian chefs have started using global techniques while working with ingredients and flavours from the country. Indian chefs have made huge efforts in making the food look delectable.

Food preferences are subjective. Some may like a dish and some won't. How do you deal with negative criticism to your cooking?

I rather call it feedback. And no one can please everyone. But each guest is important and we try to match his/her expectations.

What is the biggest thing you stand for and support as a chef?


Kitchens are high stress ecosystems and chefs are burning out. I stand for creating an environment that's less taxing and is built on camaraderie and balance. My food logic is simple. I make the familiar exciting and the unfamiliar approachable. Having said that, seasonality, tastefulness and balance of flavours play a vital role.

JALAPENO CORNITOS WITH SOUR CREAM

WHAT YOU NEED

- Cornitos jalapeno flavour nachos: 1 packet
- Cornitos chunky salsa: 1 jar
- Onion (finely chopped): 1
- Cornitos sliced jalapeno peppers
- Avocado: 1
- Tomato (finely chopped): 1
- Sour cream: 1 cup
- Coriander

METHOD

- Repeat the same with another layer of nachos on top of it.

HAZELNUT CHOCOLATE MUD SLIDE

WHAT YOU NEED

For the Pastry:

- Butter: 140 gm
- Golden caster sugar: 100 gm
- Plain flour: 225 gm
- Almond: 50 gm
- Egg (beaten): 1

For the Filling:

- Blanched hazelnut: 85 gm
- Golden caster sugar: 50 gm
- Dark chocolate: 200 gm
- Butter: 100 gm
- A splash of brandy
- Egg: 1
- Egg yolks: 3



METHOD

- Begin with pastry and mix the butter and sugar together, then add flour and almonds. Blend everything together with egg. If the pastry is very soft, chill it for 20 minutes. If not, roll out to fit in a deep 23 cm fluted flan tin; if the pastry breaks, press scraps of it into the gaps, leaving a slight overhang. Chill for 20 minutes.
- Heat the oven. Line the case with baking parchment and baking beans, then bake for 10 minutes. Remove beans and cook for another 10 minutes until golden.
- Meanwhile, toast the nuts in a dry pan until turns brown. Scatter over four tablespoon of sugar, cook until it caramelises. Then tip nuts onto a baking tray lined with parchment.

Leave to cool, then chop roughly.

- Over a pan of barely simmering water, melt the chocolate, butter and alcohol together, then set aside to cool slightly. Over the same pan, beat the egg, yolks and remaining sugar until pale and fluffy. Take off the heat, then fold in the chocolate mix.
- When case is cooked, remove from oven and turn the heat down. Scatter most of the hazelnuts over the base, then tip in the chocolate mix, pressing it down slightly. Cook the tart for 15-20 minutes until the chocolate has almost set. Leave to cool, then serve with the remaining nuts.

Noisy Neighbours too loud for Utd

Manchester City go top of Premier League with 2-0 derby day win

Manchester City manager Pep Guardiola believes his side has raised the bar in the Premier League after edging one point back ahead of Liverpool in a titanic title race with a 2-0 win at Manchester United on Wednesday.

Bernardo Silva and Leroy Sane struck for the visitors in 12 second-half minutes at Old Trafford to inflict a seventh defeat in nine games on United, who remain three points adrift of the top four.

City cannot match their record 100 points tally in romping to the title last season, but victories over Burnley, Leicester and Brighton will clinch the title on 98 points and ensure Liverpool's 29-year wait to win the league continues despite already posting a club record points tally in the Premier League era.

"We increased the level for the Premier League last season with 100 points. That's the level Liverpool are chasing. What they have done is incredible but it's in our hands," said Guardiola.

"Both teams deserve the title. But it can be just one. The team that is going to lose can't have regrets because they have given everything."

City's trip to Old Trafford was billed as the last big hurdle left for Guardiola's men to clear despite United's terrible run of form.

However, Guardiola warned of the tight turnaround before a very different type of test at Burnley on Sunday.

"Normally with this kind of victory you can enjoy it the most but we have to be calm,"

"Now we go to Burnley and we know how tough it will be. It's important to be calm. We are still not champions with three games left — it's incredible with the points we have and Liverpool have."

United boss Ole Gunnar Solskjaer slammed his players' attitude after a 4-0 at Everton on Sunday and was rewarded with a far more energetic and committed performance, even if City's greater quality eventually shone through.

WOLVES INFLICT MORE AWAY-DAY PAIN

Unai Emery refused to give up on Arsenal's Champions League hopes after seeing his side embarrassed by Wolves in a 3-1 defeat at Molineux on Wednesday.

Ruben Neves, Matt Doherty and the outstanding Diogo Jota scored the goals that condemned Emery's side to a third defeat in four Premier League games, severely denting their hopes of a top-four finish with just three games to go.

The Arsenal manager admitted his team were outplayed by Wolves, who scored three goals in the first half to give the visitors a mountain to climb.

Despite the chastening defeat the Spaniard said his side will keep striving for Champions League football, which they can achieve either through a top-four finish in



the Premier League or by winning the Europa League.

Defeat in the Midlands left Emery's men a point behind fourth-placed Chelsea.

"I usually am very critical with myself and I am angry with myself that we didn't do the gameplan we wanted — not with the players," said Emery when asked if he was angry with his team.

"First it is with me and after that my style and idea is to look in front and find a solution, not who is the player who is worst."

"First I am thinking about the solution and the solution for me is to take the possibility on Sunday at Leicester and get our best performance and the best possibility to take the three points."

Pogba odd man out in PFA team of the year



LONDON: Manchester United's Paul Pogba is the only non-Manchester City or Liverpool player to be named in the Professional Footballers' Association's Premier League team of the year on Thursday.

The 26-year-old French World Cup-winning midfielder's inclusion is a surprise after an indifferent season, although he hit a purple patch after Ole Gunnar Solskjaer arrived at Old Trafford as interim manager.

City and Liverpool have been locked in an enthralling duel for the title, with City going top again after beating United 2-0, with Pogba unable to inspire his side to a much-needed win.

City provide six of the 11 players — goalkeeper Ederson, centre-half Aymeric Laporte,

midfielders Bernardo Silva and Fernandinho and forwards Sergio Agueiro and Raheem Sterling.

The remaining four places are filled by Liverpool players — full-backs Andrew Robertson and Trent-Alexander Arnold, central defender Virgil van Dijk and forward Sadio Mane.

Van Dijk and Sterling are believed to be in the running for the player of the year award.

There is no place, though, for Liverpool's Egyptian star Mo Salah, who has scored 19 Premier League goals this season, Spurs pair Harry Kane and Son Heung-min or Chelsea playmaker Eden Hazard.

The PFA Team of the Year is voted for by members of the Professional Footballers' Association.

Manchester City had five players in the 2017/18 side but only Argentine star Agueiro retains his place from the team of 12 months ago. AFP

ROONEY FIRES DC UNITED TO TOP

NEW YORK: Wayne Rooney fired DC United to the top of Major League Soccer's Eastern Conference standings on Wednesday, scoring the game's only goal in a 1-0 win over Columbus Crew. Former Manchester United and England star Rooney curled home a low free-kick in the 27th minute to give United all three points and their first win in Columbus since 2007. The victory leaves United three points clear of second-placed Montreal Impact at the top of the Eastern Conference standings with 17 points from nine games. Montreal kept pace with United after a 3-0 away win against the New England Revolution.

LEE BOWS OUT OF SUDIRMAN CUP

SHANGHAI: Malaysia's badminton king Lee Chong Wei, under treatment for nose cancer, has withdrawn from next month's Sudirman Cup in China after doctors advised him against "exerting himself", an official said on Thursday. The decision to skip the May 19-26 tournament in Nanning marks the third time Lee, 36, fails to make a comeback and will probably dash his hopes to play in the Tokyo 2020 Olympics. He had earlier skipped the All England Open in March and the Malaysia Open in April. "I would like to confirm that Lee Chong Wei will not compete in the Sudirman Cup mixed team event," Ng Chin Chai, secretary general of the Badminton Association of Malaysia. "He is on treatment. Lee is advised by his doctor against exerting himself and not to participate in competition yet."

RANI NAMED IN WOMEN'S NAT'L CAMP

NEW DELHI: Star skipper Rani Rampal headlined a 60 player probables list for the women's hockey national camp, beginning in Bengaluru from Friday. Rani, who missed out of the five match bilateral series with Malaysia due to injury, joins the two-week camp alongside goalkeeper Savita and defender Deep Grace Ekka. A selection trial will be held on May 4 to prune down the list to 33 core probables, a Hockey India media release said. "While I am looking forward to seeing and testing the new talent coming into the National Camp, the athletes will need to perform and show their capabilities," India's chief coach, Sjoerd Marijne said. "We are constantly looking to improve and good players posing a challenge to seniors will only increase the competition within the core group and also help create depth in the team."

IND FACE RUSSIA IN FIH FINALS OPENER

NEW DELHI: Favourites India will open their campaign against lowly Russia in the International Hockey Federation (FIH) Series Finals, an Olympic qualifier event, to be held in Bhubaneswar from June 6 to 15. World ranked fifth India will take on world No 22 Russia in the final match of the opening day, which also feature games between South Africa and United States and Poland and Uzbekistan. India are placed in Pool A alongside Poland (ranked 21), Russia and Uzbekistan (43rd), while Pool B consists of South Africa (16th), Asia Games Gold medalist Japan (18th), USA (25th) and Mexico (39th). After Russia, India will be up against Poland (June 7) and Uzbekistan (June 10) in their remaining pool matches. The final of tournament will be played on June 15 at the Kalinga Stadium. Agencies

ATLETICO EDGE 5-GOAL THRILLER WITH VALENCIA

Atletico Madrid delayed Barcelona winning La Liga by a few days at least after Alvaro Morata and Antoine Griezmann each scored in a 3-2 victory over Valencia on Wednesday.

Defeat at the Wanda Metropolitano would have crowned Barca kings of Spain for a 26th time in their history, with the Catalans now set to celebrate at their own Camp Nou on Saturday instead.

A Barcelona win there over Levante will wrap up their fourth league triumph in five years and they could even be home and dry before kick-off, if Atletico fail to take a point at home to struggling Real Valladolid earlier in the day.

Regardless, success for Ernesto Valverde's side is sure-



ly now only a matter of timing given Atletico remain nine points behind the leaders with four games left to play.

Angel Correa's stunning strike in the 81st minute proved the winner after Valencia had fought back, Kevin Gameiro and a Dani Parejo penalty twice pulling them level after goals from Morata and Griezmann.

Morata's early strike continued his excellent form since his move to Atletico in January, his finish at the back post taking his tally to six goals in 13 games for the club.

Griezmann, meanwhile, back from suspension, now has 25 goals in all competitions this season, an impressive return, particularly in a side not renowned for its creativity.

Lewandowski brace wins thrilling German Cup semis

Bayern Munich will face RB Leipzig in the German Cup final next month after Robert Lewandowski fired them to a 3-2 win over a valiant Werder Bremen on Wednesday.

Lewandowski scored twice in a highly entertaining last-four tie to reach the final for the 23rd time. Bremen were unfazed by their role as underdogs, attacking Bayern all night and briefly overturning a two-goal deficit.

Yet Lewandowski's late penalty ultimately decided a fiery cup tie in Bayern's favour.

"It was the tough game that we were expecting,"



man of the match Thomas Mueller told ARD.

"Football is fun in an atmosphere like this. I have to say, I'm a bit of a Bremen fan. I love watching them, and their fans are great."

Both sides threw

everything forward in the first half, with Milot Rashica in particular causing endless headaches for the Bayern defence.

Lewandowski put Bayern in front on 36 minutes, however, and Mueller appeared to land

the sucker punch when he scooped in a second just after the hour mark.

Rashica, though, hauled Bremen back into the tie with two minutes of magic.

The Kosovan set up Yuya Osako to pull a goal back on 74 minutes, before tearing through Bayern with a brilliant solo run a minute later to net the equaliser.

Yet Lewandowski restored the lead from the spot on 80 minutes after Kingsley Coman went down in the box.

Bayern will face RB Leipzig in the final at Berlin's Olympic Stadium on May 25, where they hope to win the trophy for the 19th time.

Hamilton wary of rivals' street smarts in Baku

Championship leader Lewis Hamilton is expecting his main rivals to give him a tough time on the demanding streets of Baku at this weekend's Azerbaijan Grand Prix.

The five-time world champion, who heads the embryonic 2019 title race by six points after three races, has struggled to master the Baku circuit in the past and won last year only after Mercedes' team-mate Valtteri Bottas had a puncture when leading with three laps remaining.

That disappointment was a body blow for Bottas who did not fully recover and failed to claim a win as Hamilton romped to his fifth drivers' crown. This time, Hamilton expects him, and Ferrari, to respond.

"I was fortunate to get the win here last year," admitted Hamilton, who has developed a habit of turning unpromising races into valuable podium finishes or wins.

"I wasn't quick enough really,



right through the weekend so it will be interesting this time.

"I'm expecting Valtteri to be quick and I expect the Ferraris to be particularly quick. It will be interesting. I'm going with a mind-set that I've got to improve on my previous performances."

Victory last year was Hamilton's first at the tricky track made up of the season's longest — and very fast — straight and tight corners, some with little run-off and walls.

NADAL SEES OFF TEARFUL FERRER

Rafael Nadal showed no mercy towards an emotional David Ferrer as he eased into the quarter-finals of the Barcelona Open on Thursday with a straight-sets victory.

Ferrer is set to retire after the Madrid Open next month and made a tearful exit on what was his last appearance at this tournament.

But there was no room for sentiment for Nadal, who won 6-3, 6-3 to take one step closer to a record 12th Barcelona title.

Four of those triumphs came after beating Ferrer in the final and, at the end of this latest victory, Nadal's 37-year-old opponent saluted the crowd before placing his pink headband down on the service line.

Ferrer reached a career-high ranking of number three in the world in 2013, the same year he went closest to winning a Grand Slam too, undone by Nadal again in the French Open final.

Nadal will be gunning for his 12th success at Roland Garros next month and this was more



like the sort of form expected of the world number two, who had won 30 consecutive sets in Barcelona before falling one behind to Leonardo Mayer on Wednesday.

Germany's Jan-Lennard Struff or the talented 20-year-old Greek, Stefanos Tsitsipas, now await in the last eight before a potential semi-final meeting with Dominic Thiem, whom Nadal beat in the French Open final last year.

Osaka downs Hsieh in Stuttgart opener

World number one Naomi Osaka defeated Hsieh Su-wei 6-4, 6-3 in her first clay court match of the season in Stuttgart on Thursday.

US and Australian Open champion Osaka, who lost to Taiwanese veteran Hsieh in Miami last month, secured a place in the quarter-finals against Croatia's Donna Vekic.

Osaka, 21, broke Hsieh three times in total to beat Hsieh for the second time in three attempts this year, having also defeated her on the way to lifting the title in Melbourne.

"She's a really tricky opponent. You never really know what she's going to do," said Osaka.

Osaka needed 84 minutes to dispatch the unconventional Hsieh, a win that ensures she will hold on to top spot for at least another week.

She is less than 200 points ahead of Simona Halep in the WTA rankings, although the Romanian pulled out of this week's tournament with a hip injury.

The Japanese star arrived in Stuttgart, where she last played in Stuttgart as a qualifier in 2017, after suffering early exits in her last three tournaments.



Osaka will meet Vekic, a 6-1, 7-5 winner over Daria Kasatkina, for a spot in the last four, while seventh seed Anastasija Sevastova defeated Germany's Laura Siegemund 6-4, 6-3.
