

the media persons on Tuesday said from Betul Rajesh Yadav and Manoj Yadav were killed after they provided drinks laced with sedatives in the year 2010. A case was registered by Padhar police outpost of Kotwali

police station The truck was robbed while one of the bodies was dumped between Biaora and Raghogarh and another body was dumped around 20-25 km near Malanpur in Bhind.

The third murder confessed by Khambra was in Bhind and body was dumped in Itawa road and robbed the truck loaded with betel nut and later sold the truck with betel nut.

In the confession of two murders a case of murder of identified person was registered in Gohad Chouraha police station. Case under section 302 and 201 of the IPC was registered while the details of the murder in which driver of truck loaded with

betel nut would be investigated. Truck loaded with Iron bars with Rajesh Yadav and Manoj Yadav went missing in the year 2010 after it left the state capi-tal. Giving a relief to the elec-tricity consumers in the State, Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal on Tuesday announced to reduce the power tariff on monthly consumption of upto 200\_units from ₹4.50 per unit to ₹2.50 per unit. Announcing further relax-

ation for the people belonging to poor families, the Chief Minister said that in case a family limits its monthly electricity consumption upto 50 units, the electricity rate would then be applicable at the rate of ₹2 per unit. Manohar Lal made these

announcements on the third and last day of monsoon ses-sion of Haryana Vidhan Sabha here. He said the reduced tar-iff would ensure saving of ₹437 per month to the con-sumers, which constitute about 46.6 per cent.

The Chief Minister also said that it is a historic decision and would benefit 41.53 lakh domestic consumers in the State. He added with these announcements he had fulfilled his earlier promise to reduce the power tariff in the State. "During the last about four

years, the State Government has taken several initiatives. In some of them, Haryana is leading in the country. We have made Haryana kerosene free and also Jaunched Saksham Yojna to provide 100 hour guaranteed work to educated unemployed youth," he said.

Apart from introducing the concept of educated panchayats in the State, the State Government has also further strengthened the Panchavati Raj Institutions (PRIs) especially the Zila Parishads by decentralization of powers. Inter District Council has been con-stituted and the budget of Zila Parishads has been enhanced to ₹10 crore and next year it would further be increased to ₹25 crore, he announced. While referring to the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao programme, he said that as a result of the coopera-tion of people, the sex ratio which was 837 girls per 1,000 boys has now reached to 914 girls per 1000 boys.

FREE OF COST POWER CONNECTIONS TO DHANIS WITHIN ONE KM OF LAL DORA

Chief Minister Manohar Lal announced that free of cost electricity connections would be provided to those dhanis in the state which are situated within one kilometer of Lal Dora of villages.

He said another scheme is also under the active consideration of the State Government under which a



kilometer radius would be provided free of cost electricity connection, who will apply for the same. The aim of the State Government is to ensure that each household in the State has electricity connection, he added

decided that the left out isolated household would be provided electricity through renewable energy so that each household in state has the facility of electricity.



# **DISCREPANCIES IN ELECTORAL FUNDING STATEMENT** EC issues notice to AAP

Issuing a show-cause notice to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) after finding discrepancies in its 2014-15 electoral funding state-ment, the Election Commission (EC) on Tuesday said it may be forced to initi-ate action against the party for "prima facie failing" to follow its transparency guidelines. The EC claimed that transactions through hawala operators were "wrongly disclosed as voluntary donations".

It directed the AAP to explain as to why action should not be taken against it for fail-ure to follow EC's directions and instructions.

"Your representation should reach the office of the commission within 20 days (by October 1) from the date of receipt of the notice, failing which the matter will be decided on merits based on infor-mation available on record," the notice read.



SC: SCRAP LAWS

DISCRIMINATING LEPROSY New Delhi: The Supreme Court has asked the Centre to consider raming a law to repeal all State and local laws that discriminate against those suffering from leprosy. The court also granted siz weeks to the Government for taking a decision on the suggestions given by Vidhi Centre for Legal Policy (VCLP), an NGO to eradicate leprosy and on issues like rehabilitation and curbing discrimination against those affected by the disease.

There's good news for health workers like anganwadi workers and Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHA) and Auxiliary Nurse Midwives (ANM) working at the ground-level to improve the delivery of health and nutrition services in the society. Starting October, anganwadi workers receiving ₹3,000 so far would get ₹4,000. Similarly, those receiving ₹2,200 would get ₹3,500. The honorarium for anganwadi helpers has also been increased from ₹1,500 to ₹2,250.

This was announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday while interacting with the health workers from across the nation via a live video conference. He said the revised incentive will come into effect from October and it will reflect in their salaries

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# RAJIV GANDHI ASSASSINATION CASE **Chances of remission** bleak for assassins


Tamil Nadu The Tamil Nadu Government's decision to write to Governor Banwarilal Purohit asking him to release the seven assassing of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi who are serving life term in a Chennai jail has not gone down well with the families of persons who perished or serious-ly injured in the May 21, 1991 bomb blast perpetrated by the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) terrorists. The Edappadi Palaniswamy

Government had written to the Governor last Sunday asking him to release Nalini, Suthendraraja (Santhan), Sreeharan (Murugan, who is also the husband of Nalini), A G Perarivalan (Arivu), Robert Payas, S Jayakumar, and Ravichandran, the seven assassins accused of providing logis-tic and other help to the LTTE executioners Sivarajan, Dhanu and Suba

Dhanu was the human bomb who herself got blew up during the assassination while Sivarasan and Suba committed suicide to escape from the Indian Army commandoes who were deputed to catch them from their hide out in

Bangalore. Perarivalan had approached the apex court with a plea that though he had submitted a mercy petition to the Governor in 2015 seeking remission from the life term the latter had not taken any deci-sion. The apex court had on September 6 asked the Governor to consider the mercy petition of Perarivalan though it has not directed him to set the assassin free. Political parties in Tamil





# US wants Pakistan to | Nawaz Sharif's fully cooperate in war ailing wife Kulsoom against terrorism: NSA

The US has conveyed to Pakistan that it wants Islamabad to cooperate fully in the war against terrorism as it is a matter of "extraordinary importance" to America, President Donald Trump's National Security Advisor John Bolton has said.

During his visit to Islamabad last week, Secretary of State Mike Pompeo had pressed the new Pakistani Government led by Prime Minister Imran Khan "to do more" to rein in terror groups operating from the country's soil.

The Trump administra-tion has recently cancelled \$300 million in military aid to Islamabad after it failed to take actions against terror groups. "He (Pompeo) wanted to

convey the message that we hoped and expected that Pakistan would cooperate fully in the war against terrorism, which they had committed to

do," Bolton told a Washington audience on Monday. It (action against terrorists)

is a matter of "extraordinary importance to the US" and the one that it hopes the new Pakistan Government addresses, he said in response to a question at the Federalist Society for Law and Public

Policy Studies. "It was before my time, but the Trump administration did not take the decision to cancel a substantial part of the military aid package to Pakistan lightly.

"It was done knowing well that Pakistan is a nuclear weapons state, and the risk that the government could fall into the hands of terrorists that would get control of those nuclear weapons was particu-larly serious," Bolton said.





"He (Pant) is still very raw and I think it's a wrong policy to pick play-ers based on their IPL form. His basics of keeping are not correct. My concern is if he is not able to keep to spinners in England, he will have problems on

fourth and fifth day tracks in the subcontinent," Mongia, who has kept wickets to the legendary Anil Kumble,

said on Tuesday. Mongia then dissected his keeping against Hanuma Vihari and Ravindra

Jadeja. "You need suppleness in shoulders. His shoulders are stiff. Now in England, at least the bounce is not uneven. But the test will be against Ashwin, Jadeja and Kuldeep on the uneven fourth and fifth day tracks in India. Against pac-ers, he is just diving from the spot," said the veteran of 44 Tests and 140 ODIs.





C B Sharma advocates the importance of vocational courses to be in tandem with academic courses, which he believes will pave the way for entrepreneurs of the future. Here are excerpts How is NIOS different from CBSE?

The Central Government has two Boards — Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and the National Institute of Open Schooling. As a Board, we have been given the authority to identify courses, develop the structure and also certify them. Thus, we combine both the roles of the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) and GSE as a single organisation. We also design courses and offer proper cur-riculum in areas which are not offered by the CBSE.

For example, dancing, painting and Vedic studies. Our system caters to the students who could not get universal education, the drop-outs who could not keep up with the pace of the formal structure, the underprivileged and How have you used ICT to further

open schooling system? Recently, we made our admission procedure completely online where there is no currency exchange. We have used the television medium to reach the remotest areas with five channels. We are one of the largest partners with the Swayam portal with 25 lakh learners pursuing our online courses. An ini-tiative of the Ministry of Human Resources Development, it is an effort to take the best teaching learning resources to all, including the most dis-advantaged and bridge the digital divide for students who have hitherto remained untouched by the digital rev-olution. Most of the courses offered by the institution are available in region-al languages across the country. Since India has a wide reach of smart phones, we have used mobile technol-ogy to offer distant education. Through the app for Diploma in Elementary Education (D.El.Ed) course, more

than 10 lakh teachers have downloaded the course material. We are not only using technology to reach out, but also making sure that the students using the new ways of communication become digitally literate. We have assessed and evaluated nearly 55 lakh national dig-ital literacy mission candidates. • Have vocational courses been given

enough importance as compared to regular academic courses?

We have not paid adequate atten-tion to vocational courses. These courses are very lucrative and have immense job opportunities. immense job opportunities. Unfortunately, we have been looking at Government jobs as a means to stability but have not considered being self-employed.

fostering entrepreneurship among students. This could also reduce the pressure on the Government to change in the education structure and it has to be brought in right from the grassroots. # Equaliser for JEE Mains

From 2019, JEE Main exam will be conducted in two phases. RAMESH BATLISH tells aspirants what this means

From 2019, JEE Main will be conducted in two phases, the first for Admissions to BE/BTech from January 6-20, 2019 and the second phase for admis-sions to BArch/B Planning between April 6-20, 2019. After being taken over by National Testing Agency (NTA), there will be no major impact as far as the pattern of the exam is concerned. The exam will have the same papers as conduct-ed by the CBSE until last year. Except for the exam mode, the

pattern remains unchanged. Paper-I will be completely held in computer based mode, and in Paper-II, Mathematics and Aptitude Test will be computer based whereas Drawing will be pen-and-paper based. All the multiple choice questions will carry 4 marks each for the right

answer and negative marking of 1 mark for incorrect answer. In JEE Main Paper-I, 30 MCQ's will be asked from each subject (Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics) making it a total of 90 questions. The question paper will be available in English, Hindi and Gujarati (for students of Gujarat, Daman & Diu and Nagarhaveli). Paper-I will be conducted in two sessions per day and the candidates need to book their slots.

Paper-II includes a total of 82 questions. 30 MCQ's in Mathematics section, 50 from Aptitude and 2 questions will be asked from drawing test. All the MCQ's carry 4 marks each (with -1 negative marking) and each drawing test question carries 70 marks



EVALUATION PROCESS

As the JEE Main 2019 will be held on different days and sessions, maintaining the equiva-lence among different sets of question papers comes to the fore. To ensure that no candidate is at a disadvantage or highly benefited, normalisation of marks will be enforced for the purpose of rank-ing. Students will be ranked on the basis of their percentile scores which will be calculated as per a pre-determined formula. **Percentile scores:** Based on the percentile scores: Based on

the relative performance of all the appearing candidates by trans-forming the scores into a com-mon scale ranging from 100 to 0 for each session. Percentile Score shows the percentage of candi-dates who have scored equal to or below a particular percentile in an exam. It is the normalised score and not the raw scores. After nor-malisation, each topper of a session will get the same percentile of 100 which is the desirable one. Also the marks between the lowest and highest scores are also converted to the respective percentiles

In case of percentile tie: When two or more candidates obtain equal percentile scores then ranking will be sorted depending on their percentiles in Mathematics, then Physics and then Chemistry. Even if the per-centiles remain same, the older candidate will be ranked higher and same rank will be allotted to the candidates for a tie after this situation

Compilation of scores: After the IEE Main I will conclude in January, the result that will be declared on January 31 will display the four NTA scores — for each of the three subjects (Mathematics, Physics, and Chemistry) and the total NTA score for that attempt. Elaborating further, HCIL Senior Vice President and

Director (Sales and Marketing) Rajesh Goel said the shift towards SUVs is a global phenomenon. "India also has a similar trend and going forward one has to keep looking at the most optimum product which can be launched... to deliver maximum value to the customer, and that is what we intend to do," he said. The company is studying the market very carefully, he added. When asked if the the market very carefully, he added. When asked if the Honda has set a sales target for the all new CR-V, which would now also come with a diesel powertrain, Nakanishi said Honda has "very high aspirations" from the model. "We are looking at many many more numbers as com-pared to the outgoing model," he said without sharing any

sales target. The company has sold over 17,500 units of petrol powered CR-V units till date in the country.

# INVESTORS BECOME POORER BY OVER ₹4 LAKH CR IN TWO DAYS OF MKT CRASH

New Delhi: As stock markets continued to face heavy selling pressure for the second straight session Tuesday, investors became poorer by more than ₹4.14 lakh crore in two days of trading. The BSE bench mark index crashed 509.04 points, or 1.34 per cent, to end at 37,413.13 It had lost 467.65 points in the previous trading session also. Led by the steep decline in stocks, the market capitalisation of the BSE-list-ed companies tumbled by ₹4,14,121.84 crore to ₹1,53,25,666 crore in two consecutive days. Market experts said that rupee depreciation is a big concern for market sentiment. The rupee hit yet another new lifetime low of 72.73 against the dollar (intra-day) at the forex market. Besides, mounting tensions over trade war is a worrisome factor for the Indian market, they added. From the 30-share basket, 25 stocks ended with losses led by Tata Steel, Power Grid Corporation of India, Hero MotoCorp and Tata Motors. On the BSE, 1,841 stocks declined while 874 advanced and 152 remained unchanged. Also, 153 stocks hit their respective 52-week lows Tuesday. The broader market also depicted bearish trend, with the S&P BSE mid cap falling by 1.36 per cent and small cap index 1.37 per cent. Sectorally, the BSE consumer durables index was the biggest drag, down 2.47 per cent.

#### ONLINE HIRING ACTIVITY UP 17 PC IN AUG

New Delhi: Online hiring activity registered 17 per cent rise in August led by insurance, construction and engineering sectors and the job market is expected to stay bullish in the coming months, says a Naukri.com report. The Naukri JobSpeak Index for August 2018 stood at 2,161, up 17 per cent from August 2017 when the index stood at 1,851. According to the job portal, the insurance and construction/ engineering industries recorded 68 per cent and 22 per cent growth in recruitment activity, respec-tively. The oil and gas industry which is undergoing revival, witnessed an increase of 36 per cent in recruitment in August 2018. "The JobSpeak Index has been consistently surging ahead over the past few months...and the job market is likely to move further north in the months to come," Naukri.com Chief Sales Officer V Suresh said. He noted that apart from good performance of non-IT sectors like auto, auto ancillary, real estate, construction and BFSI, there is slow and steady revival of the IT & ITES sectors as well. The demand for young talent remained high as job cre sectors as well. The demand for young talent remained high as Job Cre-ation for freshers (0-3 years experience ) saw an increase of 19 per cent, while for the experience band of 4-7 years and mid-management roles of 8-12 years, hiring activity increased 17 per cent and 15 per cent, respec-tively. # NEERAJ LOOKS FOR CONSISTENCY

Chopra aims to consistently hit the Asiad winning distance before looking to cross 90m mark

ntar javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra Son Tuesday said he would aim to consistently hit the Asian Games Gold-winning distance of 88m next season before looking to cross the magical 90m mark in 2020 ahead of the Tokyo Olympics.

Chopra, who sent the spear to a dis-tance of 88.06m to claim the Gold in the Asian Games last month, said a "small" adjustment in his technique - which he would work out before next season -should enable him to cross the 90m mark.

"It has been a very satisfying season, I have been consistent at 85-plus throughout and I touched 88m in Jakarta. I am now confident that crossing 90m is within my grasp, it can come anytime. But before doing that I will have to throw at around 88m consistently. Chopra said in an interaction here. "I would be looking to be consistent

at around 88m next year and then go for the 90m before 2020 Olympics. But you never know even in the biggest of events (like the World Championships and Olympics), you can win a medal at this distance (of 88m)," said the 20-year-old Haryana athlete at the sidelines of an event organised by global sports drinks company, Gatorade

In 2016, Chopra became the first Indian junior world champion athlete with a throw of 86.48m but had an ordinary season last year. But this season, he emerged as a

truly world-class javelin thrower, win-ning Gold in the Commonwealth and Asian Games and finishing fourth in the prestigious Diamond League Final. He is the only javelin thrower

among the current top stars in the world to have crossed 85m while below 20 years of age. Among the active javelin throwers, six have crossed the 90m mark, including three Germans who have been consistent at around that magic mark. Chopra is aware of the tough com-

petition at the global level but said a readjustment in his technique should put him among the select few of 90m throwers.

"I have to do a small change in my technique, that has been identified along with my coach (former world record holder Uwe Hohn). This will be done before the new season next year and I hope to improve my distance," he said.

"It is about the angle of release. The spear is going sideways and more towards left. I have to bring it towards the centre for a perfect angle of release

so that the spear goes farther." The youngster said that the sixth-place finish at the IAAF Continental Cup in Ostrava in Czech Republic on September 9 was a blessing in disguise as it showed he needed the adjustment in his technique. He had a third round throw of over

"It (the spear) was over 85m but went slightly out of the sector. That shows that there is some deficiency in my technique and the angle of release. So, I have to work on these things so that I can throw farther," he added. A few weeks before the Asian

Games, Chopra's former coach Gary Calvert, who had guided him to become a junior world champion, died in China. "I became a junior world champi-on under him and I learnt a lot from him. He told me he would be with me at the Asian Games (as national coach of China) but that did not happen.

Chopra said standing at the podi-

"It did not strike me at that moment but it was talked about later. But every athletes wants to do his best for his country and play with sportsmanship spirit. That is the same for me," he said.

oung Monaco driver Charles Young Monaco and Charles Charles eran Kimi Raikkonen at Ferrari next season with the former world champion returning to Sauber, both Formula One teams announced on Tuesday. The 20-year-old Leclerc — a

"Scuderia Ferrari announces that. at the end of the 2018 season, Kimi Raikkonen will step down from his current role," the team said in a statement. ".. In the next Formula One racing season, Charles Leclerc will drive for the Team alongside Sebastian Vettel," it added. "Dreams do come true," Leclerc

posted on Twitter. "I'll be driving for @scuderiaferrari for the 2019 Formula 1 World Championship." Leclerc has had a promising start to his rookie season, finishing sixth at the Azerbaijan Grand Prix.

He has been nurtured by the Scuderia Ferrari for several years and is managed by Nicolas Todt, son of former Ferrari team principal and current FIA president Jean Todt.

Argentine legend Diego Maradona described his decision to coach sec-ond-division Mexican club Dorados as a rebirth after years battling addictions, as he officially became the team's new man-

ager on Monday. Maradona, who has publicly struggled with drug addiction, alcoholism and obesity, raised eyebrows with the decision to accept a job in the heart of Mexican drug cartel country — the rough-and-tumble state of Sinaloa.

But in his first press conference for Dorados, he described the job as a healthy new beginning after a long "sick-ness," alluding to the excesses of his past. "I want to give Dorados what I lost

when I was sick," he told the 200 journalists who packed the hotel conference room in Culiacan, the state capital, where he was officially presented as the struggling club's new coach. "I was sick for 14 years. Now I want

to see the sun, I want to go to bed at night. I never even used to go to bed. I didn't even know what a pillow was. That's why I accepted the offer from Dorados," he said.

Mexico was the scene of Maradona's greatest triumph as a player: leading Argentina to the 1986 World Cup title almost single-handedly, according to some. But he surprised the football world with his decision to coach a second-divi-

sion team who are currently in 13th place in their 15-team league. Jokes soon broke out online about his

ndre Silva scored the only goal as Andre Silva scored the only goal as European champions Portugal – without superstar Cristiano Ronaldo – got their Nations League campaign off the mark with a 1-0 win over Italy in Lisbon on Monday. Ronaldo, 33, had been left out of the

squad at his own request to focus on his new Italian club Juventus.

But the Euro 2016 winners showed no sign of missing their star striker, dominating the Italians to secure their first three points in a Group 3 that also includes Poland.

Italy coach Roberto Mancini suffered his first competitive setback after being held by Poland 1-1 in their opener on Friday in Bologna, with the Azzurri on one point after two games. 'We made too many mistakes, but

the lads gave everything," said Mancini. "We need to find a solution to scoring goals because you don't win games without scoring. That's our main prob-lem right now." Silva scored three minutes into the second half with the on-loan Sevilla striker picking up a Bruma cross to beat Gianluigi Donnarumma in the Italy goal.

Italy had been fortunate to keep their goal clear in the first half, large-

lv thanks to Donnarumma, as Portugal dictated play in the Estadio Da Luz. Bernardo Silva's effort was cleared off the line by Alessio Romagnoli with a Bruma effort deflected onto the bar.

Italy fought back with Ciro nmobile and Simone Zaza threatening just before the break.

Mancini had rang the changes with an experimental side with seven new players starting — midfielder Jorginho and Donnarumma the only pair to be retained from the draw with Poland. SPAL's Manuel Lazzari made his international debut on the right of defense. Federico Chiesa and Andre Silva both missed chances early, while a Zaza back-heel flick for Immobile was cleared in the box.

William Carvalho fired just wide from distance and Jorginho's volley was cleared. Portugal grabbed the winner soon after the restart through Silva with Bernardo Silva coming close to a second only for Donnarumma to clear.

The four-time world champions now risk being relegated from their Nations League group after also failing to qualify for the World Cup. "We must help the youth grow, as

we don't have alternatives," said former Manchester City and Inter Milan coach Mancini.
