Surrendered terrorists taking up arms against India

Ex-ultras diverting financial aid for jihad, six cases surface in J&K; forces asked to keep tabs on them

In an emerging new trend in terrorism in Jammu & Kashmir, ex-terrorists who returned through Nepal and surrendered in Jammu & Kashmir over the years have now joined terrorism again. The security agencies identified at least six such cases recently and advised the J&K Police and its Crime Investigation Department, besides the Army, to keep tabs on ex-terrorists in their respective

operational theatres.

Reports said that surrendered terrorist Mohamad Iqbal Ganie, resident of Nowpora, Doru, Anantnag, joined Lashkar-e-Tayyeba (LeT) on May 5, 2018.

In the past, ex-terrorist Ghulam Ahmed Sofi, alias Jani Baba, resident of Jahama, Baramullah, was arrested by the Army and Special Operations Group (SOG), Baramullah, of the Jammu & Kashmir Police. Ex-terrorists like Mohammad Shafeeq Bhat, Diarwani, Batmaloo and Rahi-ul-Amin Dar of Qazogund, Kulgam, are back on the radars of the security agencies.

Bhat, resident of Diarwani, Batmaloo, Srinagar, is a surrendered ex-terrorist and had

come to India via Nepal in 2001. He had been noticed providing shelter to terrorists in Batmaloo.

Another case is that of Rahi-ul-Amin Dar, alias Asif of Veesu, Kazigund, Kulgam, who had rejoined terrorism (2010-Hizbul Mujahideen) and was later killed in an encounter.

Yet another case in point is that of Sajad Ahmed Bhat, res-

ident of Wayan, Pampore, Pulwama, who was found to be an overground worker (OGW) of Pakistan-based terror group Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM).

Member agencies, especially, CID, JKP (Jammu & Kashmir Police) and the Army are requested to provide us the details of such cases (surrendered terrorists re-joining ter-

rorism) available with them," reads an Intelligence report.

fold implies that they are fighting the forces from funds being made available to them under the Government amnesty schemes, a senior security agency official said.

The return of the ex-terrorists to terror activities is matter of serious concern for the security agencies because these hardcore terrorists have well-established links across the border. These terrorists are well trained in terror activities and can provide both logistical support and strategic inputs to foreign ultras entering into the country.

The Union Home Ministry has been opposed to keeping Nepal as a "designated" route for return of these "terrorists" from Pakistan-occupied

Kashmir under the J&K Government's surrender and rehabilitation policy in force since 2010. This is mainly because ultras have been using Nepal as an informal transit route to re-enter India along with their families, and as Nepal becomes designated route they could be spotted by the ISI and targeted while returning to India.

Around 450 terrorists have returned from POK to India via Nepal even though under the surrender policy it does not entitle them to any benefit. In contrast, a few ultras have re-entered India via the three designated routes: Salamabad, Chakanda-Bagh and Indira Gandhi International Airport, Delhi.



Spurned Cong seeks foreign support: PM

More mud you sling, more lotus will bloom; vote bank politics is eating into country like termites, says Modi

Starting his speech by paying tribute to Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya on his jayanti with thoughts are an inspiration for the BJP, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday accused the Congress of looking for support outside the country, in a veiled reference to Pakistan whose former Minister recently tweeted in favour of Rahul Gandhi.

In an apparent reference to the corruption allegations over the Rafale fighter jet deal, Modi accused the Congress of indulging in mud-slinging against the Government, saying the Opposition party found it easier than debating issues like

development.

Addressing a rally here ahead of Madhya Pradesh Assembly polls, along with BJP chief Amit Shah, Modi slammed vote-bank politics and the practice of triple talaq.

The Congress has been reduced from 440 seats in the Lok Sabha to 44 seats due to its "arrogance" but it is still not ready to introspect or correct itself, he said.

"What a condition the 125-year-old Congress been reduced to! Nothing remains in the Congress... You need to look for the Congress party with a microscope now," he said at the rally also addressed by Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan.

BJP president Amit Shah

said the process of evicting illegal infiltrators from the country will not stop. Referring to the NRC, Shah said, "The process to evict illegal infiltrators will not stop, irrespective of the Congress' opposition." The recently published NRC has identified 40 lakh as illegal immigrants, he added.

Mocking the Congress, Modi said the party has been reduced to such a condition that it is "begging" with small parties for alliances.

He went on to add, "Even if they get allies, the coalition will not be successful. So, they (Congress) are looking for support from outside India... Now, will some countries decide who will become the Prime Minister of India?"

MODISPEAK

- There are elections (to civic bodies) in Jammu & Kashmir and the allies of the Congress are running away from the polls
- If the Congress has a bond with them, it should have stood with them. But they (the Congress) in J&K are saying that well, if you do not want to come along, we can go solo in panchayat elections... What type of coalition is this?

He was apparently referring to a tweet by former Pakistan Interior Minister Rehman Malik, who had said Rahul Gandhi will be next PM of India if he follows "Jet Gate" (Rafale deal) properly.

Modi asked, "Congress, what has happened to you? Have you lost (mental) balance after losing power?"

At the rally seen as launch of poll campaign, the Prime Minister said vote-bank politics, like termites, has destroyed the country.

Apparently referring to the charges of corruption being levelled by the Congress in the Rafale fighter deal, the Prime Minister said, "They (Congress) are indulging in mud-slinging because they find it easier."

He said the Congress had indulged in "mud-slinging" earlier too. "But I want to tell them, the more you throw mud at us, the more the lotus (BJP's symbol) will bloom," he added. Modi said the Congress' attempts to defame him in the last two decades haven't worked.

"Ever since I came into politics in 2001, you (Congress) have used all your strength to hurl abuses at me.

There would not be a single abuse left in the dictionary now," he said.

Much more to come in Rafale, says Rahul

Congress president Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday continued to attack the Modi Government on the controversial Rafale deal and asserted that more facts on the "dubious" deal should be expected in the coming days.

"This is the beginning, there will be more fun ahead," Rahul said, addressing the media at his Lok Sabha constituency Amethi.

The Congress has been attacking the Modi Government over an offset agreement signed by Rafale manufacturer Dassault with Anil Ambani's Reliance Group. Rahul, through social media Twitter handle, also stated that he understands the pain of jawans, Air Force officers, the families of martyred pilots as well as Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) workers, and will work to bring to justice all those who dishonoured them.

"To every Air Force officer and jawan who has served India. To the family of every martyred Indian fighter pilot. To every person who ever worked for HAL. We hear your pain. We understand how you feel. We will bring to justice all those who dishonoured and stole from you," he said on Twitter.

Reminding his constituents that an HAL unit was located in Amethi district, Rahul reiterated the charge that an offset deal wrongly went to Anil Ambani's Reliance group instead of the public sector HAL. "The youth should understand that employment opportunities have been snatched from HAL and from you all. The truth will be before

you and you can judge," he said. "The youth should pay attention. Anil Ambani has not made an aircraft all his life. He floats a company just 10 days before and gets the contract," Rahul claimed.

"Narendra Modi becomes the Prime Minister and the ₹526-crore aircraft is bought for ₹1,600 crore," he claimed. Rahul also recalled the recent row over former French President Francois Hollande's reported claim that the Indian side insisted that Dassault pick the Ambanis as their local partner.

The Congress also rejected BJP's claim that Rahul wanted the Rafale deal scrapped to help a firm linked to his brother-in-

law Robert Vadra and said the Modi Government was responding to the alleged "scam" with abuses and mud-slinging.

The BJP has alleged the Congress president is involved in a "conspiracy, internationally" and former French President Francois Hollande was part of the "nexus" to sabotage the Rafale deal.

Union Minister Gajendra Shekhawat had dragged the Gandhi family into the intensifying political row over the fighter aircraft deal, alleging that the UPA Government had called off the multi-billion dollar deal after a private company linked to Vadra was not chosen as a broker.

BJP women wing demands Maharathy resignation

Threatens stir against his 'two husbands' remark

The BJP Mahila Morcha on Tuesday demanded resignation of Agriculture Minister Pradeep Maharathy for his alleged statement that the women, who were standing on roadsides from Bhubaneswar to Puri to welcome BJP president Amit Shah, have two husbands each.

"Such works against women are not expected from a Minister. Maharathy should resign within 24 hours," demanded Morcha State president Pravat Parida at the concluding day of the Morcha national executive meeting in Puri.

Parida threatened that if Maharathy does not give resignation, BJP women activists would take to the streets across the State.

"What the BJP has been saying over the years has again been proved. Due to the BJD only, Odisha is No 1 in women assaults," Parida said and urged women to get united and teach Naveen a strong lesson in 2019 elections.

Notably, Maharathy's comment that 30,000 BJP women, who stood along the Puri-Bhubaneswar NH to greet Shah, had 60,000 husbands has gone viral on social media.

Shah's remarks betray BJP helplessness: BJD

PEOPLE KNOW DIFFERENCE BETWEEN AYUSHMAN AND BSKY
BJD'S BIJEPUR WIN TO BE REFLECTED ACROSS STATE IN 2019

BJP president Amit Shah's remarks against the State Government and opinion about Odisha's current political situations reflect utter helplessness and frustration of his party ahead of the 2019 general elections.

BJD State secretary Bijay Nayak made this observation in a statement on Tuesday. "Shah's remarks might have encouraged his party workers temporarily, but it will have no impact on the people of Odisha. Shah's language, thoughts and expressions have only indicated about his party's helplessness and frustration ahead of the elections," said Nayak.

Nayak wanted to know why Shah remained mum about various issues relating to Odisha's interests.

"While the State Government has been demanding Special Category State status, provision of funds for KBK region, implementation of Swaminathan Commission recommendations for interest of farmers and protection of Odisha's interest vis-à-vis Polavaram and Mahanadi, it is disappointing that Shah didn't say a single word," lamented Nayak.

He said Shah's silence on skyrocketing of petrol, diesel and cooking gas prices, which have burdened common people and women, clearly indicates how he and his party leaders are

concerned about Odisha. "People have tremendous trust on Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik as he has been working for development of Odisha for the last 18 years," said Nayak.

Stating that people of Odisha already know the differences between the Central Government's Ayushman Yojana and the State Government's Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana (BSKY), Nayak said the BJP has been frustrated as the Union Government's effort to implement the Ayushman Yojana became unfruitful in Odisha.

"The BJD Government is a people's Government and working for welfare of the people. There will be no impact on people even if Shah and other Central leaders come to the State thousands time. The Biju win will be reflected all over Odisha in 2019," said Nayak.

Odisha Govt silent on cattle smuggling: Maneka

Union Minister for Women and Child Development and animal rights activist Maneka Gandhi on Tuesday said cattle smuggling is a serious threat to the security of the country and alleged that Odisha is very much ahead in cattle smuggling than most of the States.

The Minister was talking to reporters after addressing a national conference on "Animal and Environmental Welfare" at the National Law University, Odisha here.

"A large number of cattle are going out of Odisha every day to Andhra Pradesh and West Bengal, from where they are being sent to Bangladesh," she said expressing her deep anguish and alleged that the Odisha Government is doing nothing to stop it. She said the State Government must do

something about it seriously because half of this cattle smuggling from the State is allowed to happen by the police themselves.

On the use of formalin in fish as a preservative, Maneka Gandhi said fishes on transit are about three to four days old as they are transported from one State to another or from one district to another after being injected formalin. "The use of formalin in fish is not only dangerous but criminal also," she said.

Expressing satisfaction over the decision of the Airports Authority of India (AAI) to drop its water aerodrome project in the Chilika lake, the BJP leader said, "Chilika is not only the treasure of Odisha or India, it is a world treasure and it must be kept in its natural state as long as we can because it is truly a natural wonder.



State to mark Gandhi's 150th birth anniv for 2 yrs

The State Government on Tuesday decided to celebrate the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi for two years starting from October 2 this year.

A decision in this regard was taken at a meeting at the State Secretariat chaired by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik in the presence of Leader of Opposition in the Odisha Assembly Narasingha Mishra, Culture Minister Ashok Panda and Chief Secretary Aditya Prasad Padhi. "A total of four subcommittees will be formed for the celebrations. Padayatras and memorial meets will be



held across the State during the period," said Minister Panda after the meeting.

"Kasturba Gandhi Ideal Schools will be identified in each block. Those with notable works in the field of cottage industry will be awarded. A special session of the Odisha Legislative Assembly will be convened in 2019 in this

regard," he added. Other significant decisions taken at the meeting included construction of statues of Mahatma Gandhi at district headquarters, inclusion of Gandhian philosophy-related contents in the +2 syllabus and naming of a major road in every district after the Father of the Nation.

Five die, twelve hurt as van falls into canal in Puri

In a heartrending incident, five persons were killed and twelve others injured after a pickup van by which they were travelling towards Puri town fell into a canal near Rua village under the Chandanpur police limits in Puri district on Tuesday.

The tragedy occurred at around 5 am when the victims, all belonging to a family of Lal Kamanga village under the Jarada police limits in Ganjam district, were on their way to the pilgrim town to immerse the remains of a deceased member of the family.

The vehicle skidded off the road on the Jagannath Sadak near Rua village and fell into the canal leading to the



death of five of them on the spot.

The deceased were identified as K Krishna (50), his brother Jagadish (40), K Yamabati (40), Abnan (7) and

Yamabati (5).

The injured ones were admitted to the Chandanpur hospital.

The condition of one of them was stated to be critical.

Odisha students invited to pursue edu in Europe

■ EU-India relationship now beyond trade: Envoys ■ Kozlowski shares experience of 1st Odisha visit

European Union Ambassador to India, Tomasz Kozlowski, invited students and researchers of Odisha to avail various opportunities under the EU-funded programmes like Erasmus+, the Jean Monnet and Marie Sklodowska Curie Actions and collaborative projects under the Horizon 2020 programme.

Addressing a Press meet here on Tuesday, Kozlowski spoke about his first visit to Odisha which aimed to strengthen the partnership between European agencies and the States in India in areas of trade, clean energy, climate change, education and combating terrorism.

Kozlowski said over 75 students and researchers from Odisha have so far benefited under the EU-funded programmes and they belonged to the National Institute of Technology, Rourkela (NITRR), Kalina Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT), Bhubaneswar and other institutions. The Ambassador also



welcomed scientist and researchers for a Marie Sklodowska Curie Fellowship in the higher educational hubs of the European countries.

He also informed that three students from Odisha have this year started their studies in Europe on a full EU-funded scholarship under the Erasmus

+ programme across three different European countries.

Mentioning about number of development programmes in Odisha supported by the European Union (EU), Kozlowski said that the EU funded Eco-Cities project, implemented by IFC, has been working closely with Bhubaneswar Development Authority (BDA), Odisha Renewable Energy Development Agency (OREDA), Odisha State Pollution Control Board, Chief

Minister's Office and others in supporting climate smart municipal services including e-waste management.

Support has been provided in undertaking the Public-Private-Partnership (PPP) transactions for green energy like public street lighting, rooftop solar in Government buildings, low income housing in Bhubaneswar and the Odisha solar park, he added.

He also highlighted effort being made to strengthen the capacities of civil service organisations, local Government to address the fluorosis issue in Baleswar district under the project "Leveraging the Water Quality Networks for effec-

tively connecting the needs of the most vulnerable and at-risk water quality affected rural populations to the National Water Quality Mission (NWQM)." Implemented by India the Natural Resource Economics and Management (INREM) foundation.

He also congratulated Bhubaneswar for being number one Smart City in the country.

He said earlier the EU-India relationship were limited to trade and development but now it has extended to cover security policy, energy, climate change, environment, transport, research and innovation, education as well as people-to-people contact aspects.

300 tribal students in Urban Hostel starve

The canteen was allegedly shut hastily after students complained about the poor quality of food served. Official sources said all the students are from the BJB, Maharshi and Rajdhani Colleges in the city. "Yesterday, we had lodged

a complaint regarding the poor quality of food and today the officials operating the canteen closed the facility. As a result, we have not had our food since last night," said a student.

Another student alleged that "In the name of dal, water was being served and when we complained, the hostel was shut." The Urban Hostel is directly managed by the Khordha District Welfare Officer and after tender, a private agency was operating the canteen, said sources.

The Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) and the International Finance Corporation (IFC) organised a stakeholders' workshop here on Tuesday to mark the completion of one year of the 'Clean E-Bhubaneswar' Programme and to showcase key activities.

About 100 institutions/organisations were felicitated for their contributions to make the project a success. Chief Secretary AP Padhi was chief guest.

"Clean E-Bhubaneswar programme has enabled collection and proper disposal of several tonnes of e-waste in a short span of time. The Housing and Urban Development Department should now

include other major cities and urban centres under similar programmes to manage e-waste," said Padhi.

Ambassador of the European Union to India Tomasz Kozlowski said, "It is impressive to see the way Bhubaneswar has progressed on wide gamut of activities, e-waste, e-vehicles, rooftop solar, etc. and cemented itself as a leading Smart City in India. The girl, a student of the Udaynath College, was on her way to the college when Raja, who is a classmate of hers, waylaid her and attacked her with a knife before fleeing from the spot.

Locals and some college students rushed to the spot after hearing the girl's screams.

The girl, who sustained multiple injuries on her waist and leg, was rushed to a nearby hospital and later shifted to the SCB Medical College Hospital in Cuttack after her condition deteriorated.

On being informed, police rushed to the spot and started investigation. Efforts were on to nab the accused.

Though the motive behind the attack was yet to be ascertained, a love affair was suspected to be the reason behind the crime.

The accused was threatening the girl and her family members for last several days, alleged the girl.

WHAT COURTS SHOULD DO?

Reconcile Fundamental Rights with Directive Principles

A unique component of the Constitution of India is the Directive Principles of State Policy. The ramifications of certain important fundamental rights have been discussed in this column earlier. It is now to be seen what the contents and purport of the Directive Principles of State Policy are.

The articles included in Part IV of the Constitution (Arts. 36-51) contain certain directives which assert that it shall be the duty of the States to follow both in the matter of administration as well as in the making of laws. They embody the aims and objects of a State under the republican Constitution, e.g., that it is a 'Welfare State' and not a mere 'Police State'; and the ideal of

socioeconomic justice.

The directives, however, differ from the Fundamental Rights contained in Part III of the Constitution or the ordinary laws of the land, in the following respects: (a) the directives are not enforceable in the courts and do not create any justiciable rights in favour of individuals, (b) the directives require to be implemented by legislation, and so long as there is no law carrying out the policy laid down in a directive, neither the State nor an individual can violate any existing law or legal right under the pretext of following a directive, (c) the directives, per se, do not confer upon or take away any legislative power from the appropriate legislature.

Legislative competence must be sought from the Legislative Lists contained in the Schedule VII to the Constitution, (d) the courts cannot declare any law as void on the ground that it contravenes any of the Directive Principles. Neither are courts competent to compel the Government to carry out any directive or to make any law for that purpose, e.g., to provide for free compulsory education

within the time limited by Art.45, or to provide adequate means of livelihood to every citizen, and (e) though it is the duty of the State to implement the directives, it can do so only subject to the limitations imposed by the different provisions of the Constitution upon the exercise of the legislative and executive powers by the State. Art. 13(2) prohibits the State from making any law which takes away or abridges the fundamental rights conferred by Part III. The Directive Principles cannot override this categorical limitation upon the legislative power of the State.

The early decisions of the Supreme Court paid comparatively scant attention to the directives in Part IV on the ground that courts had little to do with them since they were not justiciable or enforceable in the courts like the fundamental rights.

The duty of the courts in relation to the directives came to be emphasised in later decisions, which trend reached its culmination in the 13-member Bench in Keshavananda's case, which laid down certain broad provisions which are bound

to be productive of far-reaching effects in future cases. These important propositions are: (i) there is no disharmony between the directives and the fundamental rights because they supplement each other for the same goal of bringing about a social revolution and establishment of a welfare State, which is envisaged in the Preamble. The Fundamental Rights and the Directive Principles are two wheels of the chariot as an aid to make social and economic democracy a truism. The Constitution aims at a synthesis of the two and the Directive Principles constitute "conscience of the Constitution".

Together, they form core of the Constitution. They are not exclusionary, but are complementary to each other, (ii) even the conditions for the exercise by each individual of his fundamental rights cannot be ensured unless the directives are implemented, and (iii) Parliament is competent to amend the Constitution to override or abrogate any fundamental right to enable the State to implement the direc-

tives so long as the 'basic features' of the Constitution are not affected.

Since the courts form part of the 'State' as defined in Art. 36 read with Art. 12, and judicial process constitutes 'State action', the courts have a responsibility in so interpreting the Constitution as to ensure implementation of the directives and harmonise the social objective underlying the directives with the individual rights. Thus, primarily, the mandate in Art. 37 is addressed to the legislature, but in so far as the courts can indulge in some judicial law-making within the interstices of the Constitution or any statute before them for the construction, the courts too are found by this mandate.

It would follow that the courts should uphold, as far as possible, legislation enacted by the State to ensure 'distributive justice', i.e., laws which seek to remove inequalities and also attempt to achieve a fair division of wealth amongst members of the society, redressing unfair bargains. Applying the doctrine of 'harmonious construction', the court has applied

the directives to adjust the ambit of the fundamental rights themselves to give a liberal interpretation to the ambit of a legislative entry so as to make it possible for the legislature to implement a directive, but not so as to confer upon a particular legislature a power which it does not possess under the federal distribution of powers made by the Constitution.

Not only in the interpretation of the fundamental rights, the court has referred to the directives in interpreting other provisions in the Constitution, e.g., Art.371D (in the light of Art.50); Art. 302 ('in the public interest', having regard to Arts. 39, 43). Even though the directives per se cannot be enforced by the court nor can the court compel the State to undertake legislation to implement a directive, the Supreme Court has been issuing various directions to the Government to take positive action to remove the grievances which have been caused by non-implementation of the directives.

For judging the reasonability of restrictions imposed on fundamental rights, the relevant considerations are not

only those as stated in Art. 19 itself or in Part III of the Constitution but also the Directive Principles stated in Part-IV. Changing factual conditions and State policy have to be given weightage to by courts while deciding the Constitutional validity of legislative enactments. A restriction placed on any fundamental right aimed at securing Directive Principles will be held as reasonable; hence, intra vires subject to two limitations: it does not run in clear conflict with the fundamental right, and it has been enacted within the legislative competence of the legislature under Part XI, Chapter I. Implementation of the Directive Principle is within the expression "restriction in the interests of the general public" in Art. 19(6).

Whenever an action is taken by the State in consonance with the provisions in the Directive Principles as envisaged under Part IV, the same is considered to be a reasonable action. However, this does not amount to inferring that any action which is not in consonance with the provisions of Part IV would be ultra vires.

The Directive Principles provide for a guidance in interpretation of fundamental rights of a citizen as also the statutory rights. Applying the above principles, the court has applied the doctrine of harmonious construction to interpret different justiciable provisions in the light of the Directive Principles.

In short, the provisions in Part III are to be interpreted having regard to the Preamble and the Directive Principles in Part IV. The court should make every attempt to reconcile the Fundamental Rights with the Directive Principles.

The Directive Principles of State Policy are thus an integral part of the rainbow provisions of the Constitution of India. It is the ingenuity of the judiciary that invents newer ways of making out a better blend in the interest of the overall goal of the welfare society.

BJD's new Athagarh face for 2019 polls likely

MLA Swain's anguish clear

Athagarh MLA Ranendra Pratap Swain has reasons to feel cornered in the BJD. While bypassing him many leaders junior to him have been promoted as Ministers or assigned important positions. Swain not only lies neglected but even his ticket from BJD in the coming elections looks uncertain.

Even for six consecutive terms he was represented from Athagarh Assembly constituency, only one time he was given the Sports ministry in the State from 2000 to 2004 when he had defeated the then Congress stalwart and former

CM JB Patnaik here. Junior leaders like Debi Prasad Mishra, Pratap Jena, Debasish Samantaray and Pravat Biswal are given more importance than him.

A buzz is around that Tanaya Pattnaik, director of Kanak News channel and daughter of Soumyaranjan Patnaik who was inducted in BJD and elected as the Rajya Sabha member from the party recently would get the BJD ticket in the next election. She may take it as a challenge as her grandfather and former CM JB Patnaik was defeated by Swain in Athagarh.

Swain's voices of resentment are almost clear as he criticised in the Assembly Health Minister Pratap Jena dubbing the PPP mode in his department as 'Pratap Private

Partnership'. During the last Assembly session, he also criticised founder of KISS and KIMS and present Rajya Sabha member Achyuta Samanta for deceiving the common men in his medical.

Swain has had a roller-coaster ride in the BJD. Even the ticket in 2009 general election was uncertain till the last time. Due to several reasons, his candidature was cancelled by the then Returning Officer.

Swain had supported one of his political workers Ramesh Rout who had filed nomination as a dummy candidate.

Both BJD president Naveen Patnaik and the then second power centre of the party Pyarimohan Mohapatra had campaigned for Rout who was regarded as BJD supporter in the constituency in 2009.

As a result, Rout had won the election by defeating former Chief Engineer Bichitrnanda Muduli, a Congress candidate. However, Rout was kept as a hostage in the official quarter of Swain and when the first session of the Assembly started, he was escorted to the Speaker's chamber for tendering resignation.

The idea is to pave way for by election so that Swain again gets the opportunity to file nomination in Athagarh. But all hell let loose when Rout was manhandled by some workers of Swain at his home village of Radhagobindpur.

Rout absconded thereafter intimating the Speaker that his resignation was not suo motto, rather forced. The incident set off a hue and cry as to

how a legislator was unsafe due to goondaism. The ruling BJD party was in a spot.

After remaining underground for over a week, Rout was resurfaced and continued as MLA of Athagarh for about two and a half years. Meantime, Swain had started a legal battle against Rout filing a suit in the Orissa High Court challenging the candidature of Rout. After winning the case in the Supreme Court, Swain contested as BJD candidate for Athagarh by election in 2012.

But how far the electorates of Athagarh would prefer him this time is a big question mark. As he has done nothing eye catching in Athagarh despite having represented the area for over 28 years, his popularity has certainly nosedived, opined political observers here.

On the contrary, during his representation period, many units like Jagannath Spinning Mill, Maa Bauti Spinning Mill, Government cold store, OMFED chilling plant, dyeing factory have been shut down and crores of money allegedly have been embezzled in Athagarh stadium renovation project.

Almost all the colleges and NAC offices have turned the rehabilitation centre of Swain's henchmen.

Meanwhile, a youth leader, Abhaya Barik, is seen busy in organising the BJD in the Athagarh constituency for about two years.

Recently, he gathered over 10,000 BJD workers under his leadership in Athagarh town challenging Swain's organisation.


NTPC DIRECTOR VISITS TALCHER KANIHA

'Modi's jibes at Naveen unfortunate'

A university that cares: Helping flood-hit Kerala

The recent floods that hit Kerala were undoubtedly one of the worst natural disasters that the country had faced in decades. This calamity devastated the entire State, affecting more than a million people, displacing them from their livelihoods, households, families and friends. The floods potentially increased the transmission of water-borne and

vector-borne diseases appending to the already existing list of complications that Kerala was facing. Somehow, this situation of chaos and suffering tested us as a country. Help poured in different forms from all parts of the country and the globe. This gesture of help and care by many reiterated our faith in humanity.

Individuals and organisations united at this time of devastation and destruction. It may be noted that the Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT) and the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) passed this litmus test with high scores following the footsteps of the Odisha Government to lead the way in providing assistance to Kerala under the leadership of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik.

If the flood of the century brought Kerala's economy to its knees, it also brought in an army of Good Samaritans who came from all over the country to help people get back on their feet.

Immediately after the flood took its toll, two teams from KIIT and KISS were deputed to help Kerala fight this crisis. The Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS), the medical wing of KIIT, extended its support by sending a 25-member team to render medical services to victims. The team extended health services to victims in Ernakulam, Alappuzha, Thrissur and Wayanad districts for a month. The KIMS sanctioned a sum of Rs 10 lakh towards the tour expenditure of the team. I donated Rs 2 lakh from my MP salary for medi-



cines and other health kits that were most required. Our team of doctors took a ground-level understanding of the situation wherever they visited before offering timely assistance to the people in need. Our doctors offered counselling and support to families

and elderly mothers in rebuilding their houses which cascaded into the water and mud following landslides. In some areas like Pilakav in Wayanad, around 40 houses at a stretch were submerged into the floodwaters which carried tonnes of mud, stones and large barks of

trees.

The relief offered from KIIT & KISS in Kerala was primarily based in three parts: medical assistance, counselling and mapping the struggles that people faced during the floods and handling the post-flood situation which was primarily rehabilitation.

In Thrissur district alone, our medical team focused on working with PHCs, district medical officers and the Special Task Force. In Wayanad, the team was split for offering door-to-door assistance in many tribal areas. Most people in districts like Wayanad and Azhapuzha had lost their livelihoods due to severe inflow of water. The floodwaters carried large amounts of mud which eventually destroyed the crops.

For timely intervention in Kerala, the KIIT spared one of its most essential and important technical staffs for a month to extend yeoman's service. The Kerala people bestowed praise to the KIIT team comprising 75 skilled personnel for extending support and the much-needed support to the victims. The KIIT team of technicians offered door-to-door assistance to the affected homes. In due time, they established a social connection between themselves and the local people. As a result, the victims in several places requested our technical staffs to extend their operation, which in itself is a mark of their exemplary service. The team of technicians offered help in terms of repairing electric appliances, rendered basic

welding services, restoring drinking water connections and other plumbing related work in different households across different villages and wards.

Divided into smaller teams, the KIIT technicians carried on their mission to fix the problems for a maximum number of victims. They have reached out to more than 1,000 households suffering from the flood havoc.

This service by KIIT and KISS is a fine benchmark of philanthropy that every individual of this institute is fundamentally involved in. This yet again shows what a university with compassion and care can do for humanity at times of need.

India ranks 158th in human capital index

India stands just behind Sudan and ahead of Namibia when it comes to its investments in education and health-care mapped as a measurement of its commitment to economic growth in 2016, according to a study on human capital published in *The Lancet*, a global journal.

The study has noted that India is falling behind in terms of the health and education of its workforce, which could potentially have long-term negative impact on its economy. In contrast, Nepal, a country with significantly lower per capita income than India made the biggest improvement—increasing its functional health score by 28% over a 16-year period—followed by Bangladesh (22%), Sri Lanka (21%) and then India (18%). Pakistan and Bangladesh lagged behind though they fared better healthwise.

Human capital is defined as “the educational attainment, learning, and health status of the workforce that contribute to economic productivity.”

However, that India slightly improved human capital ranking from 162 in 1990 to 158 out of 195 countries in 2016 came as a big solace. The longitudinal study that spanned from 1990 to 2016 was conducted by the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME), an independent global health research centre at the University of Washington.

Finland topped the list, as per the study “Measuring human capital: A systematic analysis of 195 countries and territories, 1990 to 2016.”

Other interesting details from the study included the ranking of United States at 27, down from its earlier ranking at 6 in similar comparative studies in 1990, because of minimal progress, particularly in educational attainment, which declined from 13 years to 12.

Explaining India's ranking of 158th in 2016, an improvement from its 1990 ranking of 162, an IHME note said that it came from seven years of expected human capital, mea-



sured as the number of years a person can be expected to work in the years of peak productivity, taking into account life expectancy, functional health, years of schooling, and learning.

“Overall, India's residents had 39 out of a possible 45 years of life between the ages of 20 and 64; expected educational attainment of 10 years out of a possible of 18 years in school; and a learning score of 66 and a functional health score of 43, both out of 100.

“Learning is based on average student scores on internationally comparable tests. Components measured in the functional health score include stunting, wasting, anemia, cognitive impairments, hearing and vision loss, and infectious diseases such as HIV/AIDS, malaria, and tuberculosis”, the note said.

The study looked at four main drivers of human capital: educational attainment levels, learning outcomes measured by test scores, health outcomes across seven key areas - including rates of anaemia, hearing loss and infectious diseases - and mortality rates.

The IHME scored countries on several components of human capital: the number of years workers spend in school, the quality of their learning, and their health status. These components directly correlate to how much a government prioritises and invests in the education and health of its people.

“Our findings show the association between investment in education and health and improved human capital and GDP — which policymakers ignore at their own

BJP cries Vadra nexus in Rafale

BJP on Tuesday stepped up attack on the Congress on the Rafale deal controversy alleging a nexus between Congress president Rahul Gandhi's brother-in-law Robert Vadra and arms dealer and 'middleman' Sanjay Bhandari.

“Bhandari, who has close links with Vadra, formed a company named Offset India Solutions (OIS) in 2008 and he formed a joint venture with Rafaut, an aeronautics and armament company, as he tried to enter into an offset clause in the Rafale fighter jets deal through the back door,” BJP spokesperson Sambit Patra said here at a press conference.

The BJP leader alleged that the then UPA Government mounted pressure on the French firm Dassault Aviation to give works to Bhandari's company.

“But when Dassault verified the infrastructure of OIS, it found that they did not have the required criteria. It also found Bhandari's links with Vadra. So Dassault became adamant and they made it clear that they do not want to



enter into any kind of deal with the OIS,” he alleged. “And this was the reason why the Rafale deal was then scrapped after years of negotiations as Vadra was not getting the commission out of the deal,” he accused.

Patra also said that the Congress played with national security and the strength of the Indian Air Force.

He said Bhandari who has fled abroad was brought under investigation by the Modi Government. He said that Bhandari's company was also blacklisted by the Indian Government.

“When the BJP

Government came to power in 2014, investigations started against Bhandari. And during raids at 18 places in 2016 at the premises of Bhandari a lot of classified documents were recovered,” he said.

Alleging links between Vadra and Bhandari, the BJP leader said that during raids in 2016, the emails exchanged between Vadra, Bhandari, Vadra's close associate Manoj Arora and a relative of Bhandari named Sumit Chahdha, also came to the fore.

“In an email it was revealed that Bhandari's relative Chahdha paid ₹19 crore for a flat in London for Vadra,” Patra

alleged. He also alleged that Bhandari's firm also paid for the air travels of Vadra in 2012.

The BJP leader further alleged that the then Congress Government also rejected Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL)-developed Hindustan Turbo Trainer-40 and went for the Swiss aircraft Pilatus in 2012.

“This deal was given to the Swiss company to bribe the Gandhi family and to pay commission on the deal to the Gandhi family,” he alleged.

Meanwhile, Union Law Minister Ravishankar Prasad hit out at Congress president for his “fun has just begun” remark over Rafale deal.

Prasad was quoted by the news agency ANI that nothing else could be expected from a leader whose entire family is involved in scams.

The Union Minister said “We can not expect anything better from a leader whose entire family is involved in scams be it Bofors or National Herald. It is a matter a shame that a man who is a big liar and irresponsible is their party president.”

India, Morocco agree to boost defence ties

India and Morocco discussed the entire range of bilateral ties and agreed to enhance co-operation in the field of defence and security during talks between visiting Minister Delegate to the Head of Government in charge of the National Defence Administration, Morocco, Abdelatif Loudiyi and Defence Minister Nirmala Sitharaman here on Tuesday.

The visiting dignitary is on a two-day official visit to India and this is the first ever visit by a Moroccan Defence Minister to India.

Giving details of the talks between the two Ministers, officials said the two sides identified fields of Hydrography, Peacekeeping, Telemedicine, Information Technology and Communications as well as Counter Terrorism and Counter Insurgency as potential areas for bilateral engagement.

Armed forces must remain uncontaminated from sectarian appeal: Manmohan

Former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh on Tuesday said that India's armed forces are a splendid embodiment of the country's “secular project” and it is vitally important that they remain uncontaminated from any sectarian appeal.

He also said that the judiciary, as an institution, should not lose sight of its primary duty to protect the secular spirit of the Constitution as this task has become much more demanding with political disputes and electoral battles becoming increasingly overlaid with religious overtones and prejudices.

“The judiciary needs to arrive at its own enlightened view of its custodianship of the Constitution — irrespective of

the irresponsible and selfish politicians who have no qualms in injecting communal virus in our body politic,” he said while delivering the second A B Bardhan memorial lecture here.

Singh also said it was important for the Election Commission to ensure that religion, religious sentiments and prejudices do not get worked into election discourse. “As the custodian of the integrity of the electoral process, it is incumbent upon the Election Commission to see to it that religion and religious sentiments and prejudices do not get worked into the election discourse,” he said.

“The Commission must be thinking of rolling back the easy acceptance of over-manipulation of religious imagery,” the senior Congress leader said.

Verdict on Aadhaar validity today

New Delhi: The Supreme Court is likely to pronounce its crucial verdict on Wednesday on a batch of pleas challenging the constitutional validity of Centre's flagship Aadhaar scheme and its enabling 2016 law.

A five-judge constitution bench headed by Chief Justice Dipak Misra had on May 10 reserved the verdict on the matter after a marathon hearing that went on for 38 days, spanning four-and-half months.

As many as 31 petitions, including one by former High Court judge K S Puttaswamy, have been filed in the matter.

When the judgement was reserved by the court, Attorney General K K Venugopal had told the bench, which also comprised Justices A K Sikri, A M Khanwilkar, D Y Chandrachud and Ashok Bhushan, that this matter had



become the “second longest” one in terms of days of hearing after the historic Kesavananda Bharati case of 1973.

The Kesavananda Bharati case, which was heard by a 13-judge bench, by a majority of 7:6 had pronounced the doctrine of the ‘Basic Structure and of the Constitution’. It had held that the amendments which may affect this structure were subject to judicial review.

A battery of senior lawyers, including Shyam Divan, Gopal Subramaniam, Kapil Sibal, P Chidambaram, Arvind Datar, K V Vishwanath, Anand Grover, Sajjan Poovayya and a few others, had argued on behalf of the petitioners opposing the Aadhaar Scheme on various grounds.

Besides the former HC judge, the top lawyers argued for petitioners, who included Magsaysay awardee Shanta

Sinha, feminist researcher Kalyani Sen Menon, social activists Aruna Roy, Nikhil De, Nachiket Udapa and CPI leader Binoy Visman.

A key argument against the Aadhaar scheme was that it was violative of the nine-judge bench verdict that had held that Right to Privacy is a fundamental right under the Constitution.

The Centre, the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI), the Governments of Maharashtra and Gujarat and the RBI had argued in favour of the Aadhaar (Targeted Delivery of Financial and Other Subsidies, Benefits and Services) Act, 2016 and were represented by the Attorney General, Additional Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, senior advocates Rakesh Dwivedi and Jayant Bhushan and lawyer Zoheb Hossain. DISQUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES WITH CRIMINAL RECORD Court can't make law, it's Parliament's job: SC

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Tuesday said it cannot “usurp the power” of law-making which is vested with the legislature, but was burdened with the duty of being the final arbiter of the Constitution and protector of the constitutional ethos.

Though criminalisation of politics is a “bitter manifest truth”, which is a “termitte” to the citadel of democracy, the court cannot make a law to check it, a five-judge constitution bench headed by Chief Justice Dipak Misra said.

The bench left it to Parliament to bring in a strong law by which it should be mandatory for political parties to revoke the membership of those against whom charges have been framed in heinous offences.

“In a multi-party democracy, where members are elected

on party lines and are subject to party discipline, we recommend to Parliament to bring out a strong law whereby it is mandatory for the political parties to revoke membership of persons against whom charges are framed in heinous and grievous offences and not to set up such persons in elections, both for Parliament and the state assemblies.

“This, in our attentive and plausible view, would go a long way in achieving decriminalisation of politics and usher in an era of immaculate, spotless, unsullied and virtuous constitutional democracy,” the bench also comprising Justices R F Nariman, A M Khanwilkar, D Y Chandrachud and Indu Malhotra.

In its verdict, the bench noted the submission of Attorney General K K Venugopal that the court should

not cross the “lakshman rekha” vis-a-vis the separation of powers. The top court said going by the constitutional framework, it would be inappropriate for the court to take recourse to the other method as it cannot legislate but only recommend bringing in of a law.

While referring to the constitutional provisions, the bench said that according to the laws laid down earlier, it was clear that regarding disqualification of lawmakers, “the law has to be made by Parliament”.

“It would not be appropriate to take recourse to any other method for the simon-pure (completely genuine) reason that what cannot be done directly, should not be done indirectly,” the bench said.

The bench said the legislature has very clearly enumerated the grounds for disqualification and the language of the

provision under the Representation of the People Act leaves no room for any new ground to be added or introduced. “Any attempt to the contrary will be a colourable exercise of judicial power for it is axiomatic that — what cannot be done directly ought not to be done indirectly — which is a well-accepted principle in the Indian judiciary,” it said.

“A candidate bereft of party symbol is, in a way, disqualified from contesting under the banner of a political party. It is contended that the person concerned can contest the election as an independent candidate but, as we perceive, the impact would be the same. That apart, without a legislation, it may be difficult to proscribe the same. Additionally, democracy that is based on multi-party system is likely to be dented,” the bench said. PTI

Lt Gen MM Naravane appointed new Eastern Army Commander

In top level appointments in the Army, Lt General MM Naravane has been appointed the next Eastern Army Commander while Air Marshal Anil Khosla will be the next Vice Chief of Air Force after incumbent S B Deo retires next month. These are among several postings in the Army and Indian Air Force (IAF) notified on Tuesday.

Naravane, commissioned into the Sikh Light Infantry, is currently heading the Army Training Command, ARTRAC. He will replace Lt General Abhay Krishna who has been appointed as the Central Army Commander. Naravane will be the senior most Army

Commander by December 2019 when current Army Chief Gen Bipin Rawat completes his tenure.

In the IAF, Air Marshal Khosla who is currently Commander-in-Chief of Eastern Air Command based in Shillong will be replaced by present Deputy Chief Air Marshal R Nambiar. His place will be occupied by Air Vice Marshal V R Chaudhari who has been promoted to rank of Air Marshal. Meanwhile, Air Marshal HS Arora will go as the next Commander-in-Chief of South Western Air Command based in Gandhinagar. AVM Amit Deo who has also been promoted to next rank will be the next Director General Air Operations.

Disorder in women! Let them not bleed any further

Although hemophilia is a well-known bleeding disorder in men, not many doctors know that women carriers of hemophilia too have higher risk of bleeding and that the symptoms may be frequent and severe. Also, females with most common inherited bleeding disorders like von Willebrand disease (VWD) too fail to get timely and proper treatment as they remain misdiagnosed.

“In fact, many times even the family of the affected woman or she herself is not aware of her medical condition. As a result, they are under-diagnosed or misdiagnosed. However, if left untreated, bleeding disorders risk serious complications during menstruation, pregnancy, labor and delivery,” cautions Dr Nita Radhakrishnan, Assistant Professor at Department of

Pediatric Hematology Oncology, Super Specialty Pediatric Hospital & Post Graduate Teaching Institute and Post Graduate Teaching Institute, Noida.

She explains: “A significant number of females too have clotting factor levels that would classify them as having mild, moderate and even severe haemophilia.”

With such risks, women carriers of hemophilia or having family history should ensure a proper diagnosis and treatment from a specialist, called a hematologist. Also, women carriers should share their health status to their doctors to ensure correct treatment.

Dr Renu Saxena, Head of the Hematologist Department in AIIMS stressed on carrier detection and prenatal diagnosis of the pregnant women particularly those with bleeding disorders and carriers of

hemophilia. “If the family has a history of blood disorder then pregnant woman should come for pre-natal test within 16 weeks of pregnancy, so that they have option to abort the fetus.” Preimplantation genetic diagnosis and non-invasive prenatal testing are among the latest methods of prenatal diagnosis available to couples.

The first step in doing prenatal diagnosis of hemophilia is to determine the sex of the fetus, since only male fetuses are at risk of having hemophilia. Thus, subsequent testing may not need to be done if the fetus is found to be a female.

If the woman is found to be a carrier, then with each male pregnancy there is a 50 per cent chance that the infant will have hemophilia. The type and severity will be the same as that of other affected members of the family, Dr Saxena explained.

To reach out to the sector,

the Union Health Ministry has recently come out with a draft policy for “Prevention and Control of Hemoglobinopathies — Thalassemia, Sickle Cell Disease and variant Hemoglobins In India,” focusing on screening of pregnant women and neo-natals to detect such disorders.

Vinita Srivastava, National Consultant, Blood Cell (NHM), Union Health Ministry said that. “We want to establish hemoglobinopathy/hemophilia units at district level and above, operating in a hierarchical manner to carry out the treatment and to monitor for complications by necessary laboratory and imaging studies among others as envisaged in our policy.”

Dr Chandra Mansukhani, senior gynecologist at Sir Gangaram Hospital added that the risk of transmitting haemophilia and bleeding

complications during pregnancy and at time of the delivery represent major implications for haemophilia carriers.

To address the psychological issues of women with bleeding disorders, hemophilia carriers and men with hemophilia, Empowering Minds Society for Research and Development, an NGO has been frequently holding workshops and interaction with the community. “Lots of ignorance, taboos and stigma surrounds the bleeding disorders particularly when it comes to women. Diagnosis can have significant impact on women's physical and emotional quality of life. We try to equip them better to deal with it,” said Richa Mohan, head of the Empowering Minds.

“Self-medication, tattoos, body piercing are strictly no no for the community. Delayed diagnosis can lead to psychological problems. Loss of vir-

ginity should be considered very carefully,” she added.

Time to see a doctor in case of:

Heavy menstrual periods; Flooding or gushing of blood; Passing clots that are bigger than a quarter; Changing tampon and/or pad every 2 hours or less on heaviest day; Bleeding symptoms and someone in the family has a bleeding disorder, such as von Willebrand disease, or a clotting factor deficiency, such as hemophilia; heavy bleeding from dental surgery, or surgery, or childbirth and/or have other additional bleeding symptoms such as frequent prolonged nose bleeds, prolonged bleeding from cuts or easy bruising.

'WOMEN MAOISTS WAYLAID TDP LEADERS'

What has caught the attention of the probe team was that in the footage one Maoist was seen talking on a gadget with an antenna raising a suspicion that the Maoists might have used satellite phone as there was no cellular signal in the area.

RAJKUMAR ABDUCTION CASE

All acquitted as prosecution fails to furnish proof

A court in Erode district of Tamil Nadu on Tuesday acquitted all the nine accused in the abduction of Kannada superstar Rajkumar by forest brigand Veerappan in 2000. K Mani, judge of the Third Additional District Court in Gobichettipalayam in Erode district, came down on the prosecution for its failure in presenting a fool-proof case. Both Rajkumar and Veerappan breathed their last in 2006 and 2004, respectively. Veerappan, who had terrorised south west Tamil Nadu was shot dead by the Special Task Force led by K Vijayakumar and constituted by the then Jayalalithaa Government. Judge Mani criticised Rajkumar's family for not coming forward to file a complaint against the people who abducted the Kannada actor. He said the prosecution failed to provide even an iota of evidence to prove that the accused were connected to Veerappan and his aide Sethukuzhi Govindan.

The Kannada film actor along with three of his associates were kidnapped by Veerappan from his farm house at Dhodda Gajanur Village in Talavadi on July 30, 2000. Rajkumar and his wife Parvathamma had gone to the farm house for a house warming ceremony when the incident occurred. While one of the victims escaped from Veerappan's captivity in September 2000, the rest including the actor were released by the brigand after 108 days in November 2000. The interim period saw the then Karunanidhi Government in Tamil Nadu deputed the editor of a Tamil weekly as interlocutor. What transpired in the discussions with Veerappan that took place deep inside the reserve forests of Gobichettipalayam was never released. It transpired that the abduction had to do something with the quarry business owned by the sons of the actor and the protection money they owed to Veerappan. The incident had become an international news as Tamil chauvinist organisations too pitched into the negotiations.

Sterlite, locals take stand-off to Chennai

The case of May 2018 riots against the Sterlite Copper plant at Thoothukudi which claimed 13 lives took a new turn in the last two days with the pro-Sterlite brigade submitting petition demanding opening and the opposing group demanding closure of the copper smelter unit. Both the public hearings held at Thoothukudi and Chennai on Sunday and Monday by the National Green Tribunal-appointed committee saw tense moments with petitioners resorting to fisticuffs and assaults. The committee of experts consisting of Tarun Agrawal, former Chief Justice of Meghalaya High Court, Satish C Garkoti, scientist, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change and HD Varalaxmi, senior environmental engineer, Central Pollution Control Board, examined the factory premises at Thoothukudi and surrounding areas and also held a public hearing on Sunday. Though hundreds of people had gathered at Thoothukudi Polytechnic College to submit their submissions, groups which were behind the riots against Sterlite drove them away from the venue on Sunday. The company management has succeeded in spreading the word through selective leak

in the media that all is well at Thoothukudi. Muthukumar and Ganeshan, two farmers from Udangudi village were man-handled by the agitators and had to be escorted out of the premises by the police. "We wanted to tell the authorities from New Delhi that there are no environmental or ecological issues here," said Muthukumar. Agrawal told reporters that majority of the persons who had assembled for the public hearing were for the closure of the factory. As the crowd became uncontrollable, the committee told the people supporting the factory to attend Monday's public hearing at Chennai. "I was assaulted by unidentified persons and the police did nothing to stop them. When it became clear that I cannot withstand further blows, the police took me out and sent me away," said S Thyagarajan, a 62-year-old contractor who also said that the anti-Sterlite agitation was yet another attempt by radical and chauvinist elements to get the factory closed. Thyagarajan made it to Chennai on Monday and submitted a memorandum to the committee stating that the locals and workers of the factory were unanimous in their demand that the factory should be opened. "The rioting was a pre-

planned move and the local people do not have any role in it. But the people who fell to the bullets were innocent while the rioters escaped without any trace," said Thyagarajan. Though the NGT appointed committee had announced that they would meet on Monday only those people who want the factory to be opened, many anti-Sterlite people had assembled in Chennai too. Vaiko, the MDMK leader alleged that he company management had paid money to mobilise supporters while the locals were left high and dry. According to the MDMK leader, all submissions by the Sterlite employees were lies. Shanmugasundaram, a lawyer monitoring the operations of Sterlite pointed out that the riots had all the elements of the agitation undertaken by the Peoples Movement Against Nuclear Energy, the outfit which had campaigned against the Kudankulam Nuclear Power Plant. "The agitation here is sponsored by Left Wing Extremists, Tamil chauvinists and of course the Church," alleged Shanmugasundaram. A mission constituted by Chennai based Vedic Science Research Centre had submitted a memorandum to Union Home Minister alleging that the anti-Sterlite riots were fomented and led by anti-national organisations.

TMC determined to foil today's saffron bandh

With the BJP in its desperation to grow beyond its size in the State by making Wednesday's dawn-to-dusk Bengal bandh a success, the ruling Trinamool Congress leadership on Tuesday made it clear that "no bandh will be tolerated" directing all the Government concerns to ensure hundred percent attendance and cancelling all leaves for the day. "All the Government staff are hereby directed to join work on Wednesday failing which a day's salary will be deducted," State Education Minister Partho Chatterjee who was handling the affairs in absence of Banerjee, presently in Milan attending a business meet said while senior secretariat officials also warned absence from office on Wednesday could also cause a breakage in service. "We will take the bandh as seriously as the ones earlier called by the CPI(M) only to be

foiled by a determined approach of the Chief Minister," another senior Minister Firhad Hakim said even as the police on Tuesday lathi-charged the ABVP supporters who were trying to blockade road at busy Esplanade crossing. Twelve ABVP supporters were arrested following a brief jostling with the police and a

lathi-cvcharge even as BJP State president told a gathering in Hemtabad that "any effort to thwart the bandh with State power and brute force of the Trinamool goons will be responded to strongly by the people in general. They will get a taste of BJP's strength tomorrow." The State Government

would be held responsible for any untoward incidence happening on Wednesday because "it is TMC's arrogance that they are trying to foil a natural bandh," Ghosh maintained. The BJP earlier called a 12-hour bandh to protest against the death of two students in an alleged police firing at an Islampur school in North Dinajpur district of North Bengal. Agitating students of Darbhith High School had allegedly clashed with the police when they were stopped from engaging in a brcdkbating while they were protesting the appointment of Urdu and Sanskrit teachers instead of Bengali, History, Maths and other teachers required. Subsequently two students received gunshots and were killed. The locals and the BJP claim the police fired at the students while the Government have denied the allegation.

"Our workers will be on the streets alongside the police so that no disturbance takes place," Hakim said adding "our boys can smash the BJP workers like ants but we won't do that as Mamata Banerjee believes in deep-rooted democracy." The Chief Minister had already told from Milan that the BJP was trying to provide a communal twist to the whole affair and asked the people to "remain alert about their dirty tactic." Chatterjee said all the offices, educational institutions will remain open on Wednesday. Transport Minister Suvendu Adhikary said public transport would function normally and ensured ₹75,000 insurance for partly damaged vehicles and ₹5 lakh for fully damaged vehicles in the bandh. Each Minister had been given the charge of ensuring normalcy in one's constituency before joining a Cabinet meeting late in the noon to take stock of the situation, sources said.

RIISING CRIME IN BIHAR

Govt 'appeals' to criminals not to indulge in criminal activities during Pitrapaksh

Amid the sudden spurt in crime and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's claim that crime rate has come down, the law and order has become a hot topic in Bihar these days with the Opposition slamming the Government and Deputy CM Sushil Kumar Modi even urging the criminals to hold their activities at least during 'Pitrapaksh' in Bodh Gaya. Nitish himself put a question mark on the governance saying there was lack of coordination in the bureaucracy and particularly between IAS and IPS officials. The administration was not up to the mark due to poor coordination between the DM and SP in the districts. "The incidents of murders were mainly due to land disputes," the CM said and expressed suspicion of the involvement of the officials in such disputes. Addressing a police function here on Tuesday, the CM asked the DGP, Chief Secretary and home secretary to look into this issue and ensure coordination between the IAS and IPS officers and ask them to hold meeting twice a month. The CM stressed on maintaining social balance in the posting of police in the police stations because the maintenance of law and order started from police stations level. Addressing another function Nitish said, "Nobody can stop mar-kat (violence and killings). Some people have interest only in violence and bloodshed. But this is a small part of entire picture still only this picture is blown up and there is no mention of the good works done by o u r

Government for the people." The political circles were talking about the speech of Deputy CM Modi at Bodh Gaya on Monday when he "appealed" the criminals not to indulge in crime for 15 days during Pitrapaksh."During this period people from outside and abroad come to Gaya for pind-dan and the criminals should not do anything which bring bad name to Bihar. The police is alert and make all preventive care still crimes are committed. I with folded hands appeal to criminals not to commit crime at least during this period," Modi said while inaugurating the fair. Modi's appeal to the criminals triggered a barrage of attack on the Government. "After folding hands, Modi should also hold their feet," reacted leader of opposition Tejashwi Prasad Yadav. RJD supremo Lalu Prasad who is in jail hospital, tweeted, "You are folding hands and holding and washing feet of criminals. You should feel ashamed. Government is not run by making requests to criminals and seeking mercy but with might strict actions. You have grabbed power through back door so you have no courage." Modi retaliated, "After being convicted in four cases Lalu could neither contest elections nor issue statements from jail. The CBI and judiciary should take notice of his political statement through tweets and stop him from playing politics."

Three more Gir lions die, death toll rises to 14

It seems the situation is going from bad to worse at the only abode of Asiatic Lions - Gir Forest National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary - and surrounding areas as the death toll rose to 14 with three more lions dying. All these casualties of this endangered species belonging to the cat family occurred within a span of a fortnight. Sources in the State Forest Department confirmed that two lionesses aging four and nine as well as a six-month-old cub succumbed to illness. "Forest beat guards found carcasses of lioness in Dalkhanian range of Gir Sanctuary. The cub which was found ill was brought to a rescue centre, but died during treatment," said an official. Interestingly, two more deaths of lions registered despite the fact the State forest department has formed 64 teams to screen and shift sick lions to rescue centre to prevent further casualties of lions. Talking to The Pioneer Chief Conservator of Forest, wildlife circle DT Vasavada prima facie the cause of deaths of two big cats seemed to be infection and some disease, but the exact reason of death would be known only after the post-mortem report. From the first death of lion on September 12, 2018, the State forest officials are maintaining that the cause of death was infighting and territorial war amongst the lions and there wasn't any human interference in the death of the big cats. Around a decade ago in the year 2007, poaching of eight Asiatic Lions created lots of hue and cry over the conservation of the endangered species. The then Narendra Modi led Gujarat Government had allocated special funding to protect the lions in the Gir area. In fact it was because of Modi's effort to hard sell Asiatic Lions through a tourism campaign in which Amitabh Bachchan was the brand ambassador, tourists from all across the globe are pouring during winter season to see the majestic animal. The deaths would definitely impact tourism activities in the area.

Shah, TRS in Telugu Twitter war over health insurance scheme

The Twitter war between the ruling Telangana Rashtra Samiti and the BJP has taken a new turn with the BJP national president Amit Shah's handle tweeting in Telugu to take the fight into the rival camp. In his first tweet in Telugu, Amit Shah strongly objected to the Telangana Government keeping itself out of the "Ayushman Bharat" nationwide health insurance scheme and it evoked an immediate response from the State's Information Technology Minister K Taraka Rama Rao. While Amit Shah said that TRS was being selfish by refusing to implement the Ayushman Bharat scheme, Rama Rao pointed out that the State was already implementing

health an insurance scheme, Aarogya Sri. Amit Shah said in his tweet in Telugu that it was saddening to see that the people of Telangana were not able to benefit from the scheme because of the selfish thought of TRS, KTR shot back on Twitter, "you are clearly misinformed @amithshah ji. The successful Arogya Sri program of Telangana is far superior in terms of coverage (80 lakh families) in comparison to Ayushmann Bharat (only 25 lakh families in Telangana). We are a role model state in universal health coverage". While Ayushmann Bharat scheme provides a coverage of ₹5 lakh per family per annum Arogya Sri provides an annual coverage of ₹2 lakh per below poverty line family and it can be extended to ₹13 lakh

on cases to case basis. State Health Minister C Lakshma Reddy also joined the war of words pointing out that the 8 million families in the State were benefiting from the free of cost medical treatment under the Arogya Sri scheme. He argued that if the Central Government scheme was implemented it will create complications as identifying only 25 lakh beneficiaries out of 80 lakh and leaving out 55 lakh families will be difficult. Amit Shah said that the TRS Government should explain to the people why it had not implemented the scheme and deprived the poor people of the benefit. Amit Shah's handle tweeting in Telugu was being seen as an indication of the BJP's strategy to put the IT tools and the social media to the full use in the run-up to the Assembly elections.

400 more companies of Central forces for J&K local polls

Notwithstanding the ground hostilities to the conduct of local polls in Jammu & Kashmir, the Governor's administration on Tuesday elaborated a comprehensive plan to hold the polls by bringing in 400 extra companies of Central security forces and ensuring safety of the contestants. The Government would also pay a month's extra salary to the employees involved in the conduct of the polls while the enhancement in remuneration of special police officers would be announced shortly. The administration emphasised that the elections were necessitated to prevent loss of a whopping ₹4,335 cr for grassroots level development that is channelled through urban local bodies and panchayats. Addressing a press conference here, Chief Secretary BVR Subramanyam said that the elections would be held according to the schedule issued by the Chief Electoral Officer and adequate security plan has been devised to ensure safety



and security of candidates. He said the candidates can be provided secure hotel rooms in capital Srinagar, Anantnag and Baramulla should they require any protection. He said a whopping amount of ₹4,335 crore will be devolved to the Urban and Rural Local Bodies for developmental activities immediately after the conclusion of the poll process. "This huge chunk of funds allocated to the State under the 14th Finance Commission award has been withheld as no elected Urban and Rural Local Bodies are in place in the State," he said. He said the Government is initiating some far-reaching changes in J&K Panchayat Raj Act to make the rural elected bodies more powerful decision-making entities with extended reach. He said there are 4,490 panchayats in the state and as many Sarpanches are to be elected. The total number of Panchs in the State will be 35,000. "There will be around 39,500 elected representatives in these Panchayats," he said adding 79 urban local bodies and about 1200 wards — 600 each in Jammu & Kashmir region would get representatives through the elections. He said that adequate security arrangements have been put

in place for the smooth conduct of polls and 400 additional

National Conference spokesman Junaid Mattu resigns from party, to contest urban local body polls

Srinagar: A prominent face of the National Conference, its State spokesman Junaid Mattu, on Tuesday announced resignation from the party to contest urban local body polls. The NC has decided to stay away from the polls in protest against linking them with a bunch of litigations in the Supreme Court on Article 35A that guarantees special privileges to the residents of J&K. The NC was the first regional party to announce boycott of the polls. The PDP and CPM followed suit citing the ground situation and also issues related to Article 35A as the reasons for their boycott. "Based on my humble disagreement with the party's decision to boycott the upcoming ULB and panchayat polls, I have just sent my resignation

from the party to the JKNC General Secretary," Mattu wrote on Twitter. "I strongly believe that leaving our grassroots democratic institutions open to misrepresentation would inflict serious harm on the State and also wreak havoc with our social fabric and cultural legacy," he wrote. "I will announce my candidature for the ULB elections from Srinagar tomorrow Insha Allah and I will remain committed to serving my people and helping the city I grew up in meeting the challenges it's faced with. I won't be addressing the media or taking any questions today," he said. The NC in a tweet said that the Mattu's resignation from the basic membership of the party was accepted. PNS

companies of paramilitaries are reaching Kashmir for election related security arrangements. Subramanyam said there was no link between the timing of holding panchayat elections in the State and deferment of hearing of the PIL challenging Article 35-A before the Supreme Court. "There have been multiple postponements of the hearings of Article 35-A in the Supreme Court before and after the panchayat elections were announced," the Chief Secretary said. "It is just accidental that the case is listed in January and the panchayat elections are to be completed before that." He said the Governor's administration is going to be consistent in its stand before the apex court that an elected State Government should fight the case. "The stand of the governor's administration is going to be consistent in the Supreme Court that there are many serious complex issues which have to be discussed as far as Article 35-A is concerned and these should not be discussed when Governor's rule is in place," he asserted. He was responding to

the question seeking an answer about why Governor's administration is not discovering a new reason for hearing in the PIL other than 35A. "These should be discussed when an elected Government is in place, which will take a solid position in the Supreme Court. So, there is absolute clarity that Governor's rule is not about deciding Article 35-A," he said. The Chief Secretary said the employees who will perform poll duty will get an additional one month salary. He said this is unprecedented and has not been done anywhere across India, so far. Besides, the Chief Secretary said the Government is considering a hike in the wages of Special Police officers working in Jammu & Kashmir in next few days. Offering details of the security situation in which some SPOs were recently killed, the Chief Secretary said: "The resignations compared to total number of SPOs who are above 30,000 is negligible." He said all the SPOs have been instructed about their security. Subramanyam said that problems of security restricted

to only certain areas in South Kashmir and in the north and central Kashmir situation are not worrying. Asked about the post-election security plan for the candidates, Subramanyam said, "We have even plans for those who win as they will be at a higher risk." Asked about the voters' security, the Chief Secretary said: "That is being handled on the law and order front. There are threats... we are confident that we can handle it." Asked if holding polls was prudent in view of the boycott by two major political parties in the valley, he said there was no question of trusting the elections on the people. "There is a lot of enthusiasm on the ground. Two national parties (the BJP and the Congress) are participating. If you go to Jammu, you will see the street-level campaigning," he added. Subramanyam said more than 700 forms have been taken by prospective candidates for the first phase of urban local bodies, which will be held on October 8. The last date for filing nomination for the first phase is Tuesday.

AIMIM MLA Waris Pathan apologises for his 'Ganpati Bappa Morya' chant

After he came in for severe flak from his party leadership for hailing Lord Ganesh, All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) MLA Waris Pathan on Tuesday apologised for his "Ganpati Bappa Morya" chant at a Ganesh Mandal event in his constituency during the weekend and said he would never utter such a praise on a Hindu God in future. In a video message uploaded on his Twitter handle, Pathan said: "A few days ago I inadvertently uttered a chant (of Lord Ganesh). I bow before Allah and say that I made a mistake, God willing, I will not make such a mistake in future. After all I am also a human being. Every human being commits mistakes. I am admitting my mistake. I urge Allah to forgive me for my mistake. I urge everyone to pray for me". A controversy had broken out within the AIMIM after he

chanted "Ganpati Bappa Morya" and prayed to the elephant-headed God to remove obstacles of all people, at an event organised on Sunday in his home constituency of Byaculla to celebrate Ganeshotsav, an act his party had not taken kindly to - So much so that his party leaders and workers seeing disrepute to his party through his chant hailing Lord Ganesh. Meanwhile, the ruling Shiv Sena came to Phatan's defence for his "Ganpati Bappa Morya" chant. "What wrong has Pathan done? Was it a crime on his part to chant Ganpati Bappa Morya? Why has he apologised for his chant hailing Lord Ganesh? Hindus go to Masjid. The Hindus even go to Ajmer. That being the case, should we draw any inference that those Hindus will switch to Muslim religion. I am surprised as to why Pathan chose to apologise. His apology was unwarranted," Shiv Sena MP Arvind Sawant said.

Taj Mahal protection: SC gives UP time till November 15 for vision document

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Tuesday extended till November 15 the time for Uttar Pradesh Government to come out with a vision document on protecting the Taj Mahal, and asked it to consider declaring a portion of the area surrounding the monument as 'heritage'. A bench of Justices Madan B Lokur, S Abdul Nazeer and Deepak Gupta was informed by the State Government that Delhi-based School of Planning and Architecture, which is preparing the vision document, has sought extension of time till November 15 to finalise it. Additional Solicitor General (ASG) Tushar Mehta, who was appearing for the State Government, told the court that "in-principle" there cannot be any objection in declaring entire Agra as a heritage city but that would have several ramifications. He said it would be difficult to declare entire Agra a heritage city but some portion of it could be brought within its ambit covering sites like Taj Mahal, Fatehpur Sikri and Agra Fort. "If it is difficult for entire city of Agra then some area surrounding the Taj Mahal can be declared as heritage," the bench told Mehta. The ASG said the State Government has sought the assistance of Ahmedabad-based Centre for Environmental Planning and Technology on this issue and asked it to prepare a report on it. PTI

Deep Deepawali to be a mega event, says Rita

Lucknow: Aiming to catapult Deep Deepawali festival in Ayodhya to a global platform, the UP Government has planned to make it a mega event this year and was even attempting a Guinness Record by lighting over 3 lakh diyas at ghats during the three-day function to be attended by a delegation from Korea that could have senior Ministers. Deep Deepawali will be held on November 11 this year. Tourism Minister Rita Bahuguna Joshi told *The Pioneer* on Tuesday that the function was organised at a micro scale last year but this year the Government wanted to take it to a mega level. "Last year, 1.67 lakh diyas were lighted at one time at Ram Ki Pauri ghat at Ayodhya and this year, over 3 lakh diyas will be lighted. Last year, the event was a one-day affair, while this time round, it will be a three-day event. We have invited Guinness Book of World Record officials to record it" Joshi said. The Tourism Minister said that last year the facade lighting was for a day while there would be permanent lighting this time so that the entire building adjoining Ram Ki Pauri and both bridges at Ayodhya could be seen. "Not only lighting, the government has plans to organise elaborate culture programmes this year too. Last year, Ram Lila was staged but this year at least four troupes from across the country particularly from South India will perform. This time dignitaries will come from Korea.

2 terrorists killed in encounter in Sopore

Two terrorists were killed during an encounter in Tujjer area of north Kashmir's Sopore town on Tuesday. Official sources said that the encounter started after a joint team of the Army's 22 Rashtriya Rifles, Special Operations Group (SOG) and CRPF cordoned off the area. The two terrorists were shot dead during the encounter. The authorities snapped the internet services in the area for "security reasons." A police spokesperson in a statement said that during the searches, hiding terrorists fired on the search party, which was retaliated leading to the

encounter. "In the ensuing encounter, two terrorists were eliminated. The identity of the killed militants is being ascertained," the spokesman said. The spokesman said that some arms, ammunition and incriminating material has been recovered from the site of encounter. Police has registered a case in this regard and the investigation has been initiated in the instant matter. The encounter took place a day after five infiltrators and an army soldier were killed in a fierce gun-battle in Tangdhar sector of north Kashmir's Kupwara district in the State.

State of flux

Congress core committee meets to decide on alliances for the States due for Assembly elections

S o, Congress worthies have finally found the time to sit down and discuss the possibilities of alliances and/or seat adjustments with other political parties in the States headed for Assembly elections and the 2019 Lok Sabha poll. The AICC committee on alliances, also known as the core group and comprising old war horses AK Antony, Ghulam Nabi Azad, Ashok Gehlot and Ahmed Patel, met on Monday and Tuesday in the Capital, a week after the party with which an alliance for the Congress would have proven most beneficial had already bolted, as it were. Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) chief Mayawati who was said to be in discussions with Congress leaders for an alliance in Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh for the forthcoming Assembly polls has already announced a tie-up with Aijit Jogi's regional outfit in Chhattisgarh and issued a list of 22 candidates for seats in the 230-member Madhya Pradesh Assembly concentrated in the Bundelkhand, Vindhyha, Mahakoshal and, crucially, Gwalior-Chambal areas which is considered the stronghold of Congress campaign committee chief for the State, Jyotirajyoti Scindia. Chhattisgarh looks like a lost cause for the Congress in terms of an alliance. Indeed, the party would be better advised to fight the election on its own in the State, focussing on increasing its vote share, strengthening the organisation and entering into local tactical understandings with the BSP-Jogi alliance where feasible in taking on the formidable Raman Singh. In Madhya Pradesh, however, Congress leaders led by the redoubtable Kamal Nath, who is also the State PCC president, are still thought to be in talks with the BSP for a pre-poll alliance, on the assumption that Mayawati's unilateral declaration of 20-odd candidates is just the opening salvo for the negotiations. This may well be the key alliance which the Congress has to forge if it is serious about denying Shivraj Singh Chouhan another term. The Chief Minister has of late made overtures to the so-called upper castes on the issue of misuse of the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe (Prevention of Atrocities) Act and has thus opened the possibility of an SC-ST-Muslim-disgruntled with BJP social coalition coalescing behind a united Opposition. Allied to the outcome of this potential alliance is a Congress-BJP deal in Rajasthan where the latter, though not as strong as it is in Madhya Pradesh albeit in pockets, may tip the balance in what is turning out to be a close contest despite initial expectations of a BJP rout. Garnering support of caste-based organisations and not necessarily political parties is where the game is in these parts. The fourth State headed for polls is Telangana where Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao has dissolved the Assembly early. While the Congress has already worked out the contours of a deal with the TDP, Communists and smaller regional parties in the State, it is not thought to be in a position to dislodge KCR who anyway has made it clear that once he has won the State he expects to, his party will fight the Lok Sabha polls on its own steam and look post-poll support to a non-Congress, non-BJP front as the first choice.

What the Congress can learn from regional parties in its dalliance with alliances is: Forget Lutyen's Delhi talk of an impractical one-on-one fight against the BJP, put your party's interest first and seal alliances in different States based on specific conditions prevailing there rather than searching for ideological affinity.

WORDEDIT Immersed in preservation

While it is important for national life that Ganesh Chaturthi, Durga Puja and all other Indian festivals are celebrated with pomp, gaiety and devotion, leaders of the Hindu community which has since antiquity had a symbiotic and symbolic relationship with nature should begin the process of encouraging our revered idols to be made of eco-friendly, natural materials. Immersion of idols in our sacred rivers is a beautiful and significant religious-cultural practice which must continue but we must take care to preserve our waterways.

Saving Tomy

The dramatic rescue of Commander Tomy was quite a feat but should it raise questions about long-distance sailing expeditions?

It was quite a dramatic rescue on the high seas, with his boat Thuriya dismantled, and Commander Abhishat Tomy himself temporarily crippled, the fact that a small boat in the middle of the southern Indian Ocean, considered the wildest part of seas in the world, was located and Tomy rescued is a tremendous achievement. We wish the Commander a speedy recovery and hope that he is able to get back on a boat, maybe a much larger Indian Navy warship sooner rather than later. But this unfortunate incident, and that of a fellow Irish sailor competing in the same Golden Globe Race, a solo round-the-world sailing event, should raise some concerns about these long-distance sailing races. These events are undoubtedly a tremendous test of human endurance, but the risks involved are immense. Participants like Commander Tomy are very aware of the risks involved and he himself will be aware of the risks. Rescue on the high seas, particularly on a solo expedition, are difficult and thanks to the tremendous multinational effort which involved the Indian Navy's highly capable naval reconnaissance, the Boeing P-8i as well as Australian and French naval and civilian ships alongside the INS Satpura, that Commander Tomy will live to see another day. This raises a very important question, that is, are these events too dangerous?

One of the things that makes human species is our constant need to push our physical and mental and in some cases technological boundaries. Solo sailing expeditions, ultra-marathons through the Sahara desert, going to the bottom of the deepest parts of the Ocean and now the race to send a man to Mars within the next decade. But pushing the boundaries carries huge risks and in the past decade, increasingly many of us are becoming reluctant to take risks. Technology has reached a level where playing it safe is very easy, so is questioning those who undertake such massive risks upon themselves. Are the costs of rescuing one man from the middle of the high seas worth it, given that the money spent could have been used somewhere else? In our opinion, it is worth it because mankind should always keep pushing themselves to achieve more. Human achievement must not stall because we want to play it safe. It is only because we keep pushing the boundaries that we have achieved what we already have as a species. And there is another thing, Commander Tomy's boat was found in the middle of nowhere, a spot not so far from where a Malaysian Airlines Boeing 777 once disappeared. Which reminds us, everyone has still not been found, something that remains a mystery and one of humanity's greatest failures.

Seeking the plane truth about Rafale deal

Amidst a political slugfest over the Rafale deal, coming clean should lead to a truce that is urgently required for the IAF to breathe normally and to prevent further damage to India's emerging power reputation

Rafale will stick to the Government like the Sikkim keech, especially after Former French President Francois Hollande's Anil Ambani bombshell which France and Dassault have rejected for fear of losing the Rafale contract a second time. The Congress will make Rafale the Modi Governments Bofoors. Both are excellent weapons. No one has questioned the calibre of the equipment but only its cost, the alleged scam (₹41,000 crore) including offsets. The Government is relying on Modi's confidence in him. The Congress after voter-data analysis has discovered that the highest level of curiosity item is Rafale. The Congress will launch nation-wide protests covering every State, district and block, and submit petitions seeking a probe. It has already sought a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) and urged the Comptroller and Auditor General of India/Central Vigilance Commission (CAG/CVC) for an early

report. A PIL for an independent probe into procedural irregularities is to be heard in the Supreme Court on October 10. Innovative protests, like paper aircraft and balloons representing Rafale, will go up in the air. A team of elders, former BJP stalwarts and lawyers are quizzing the Government with embarrassing regularity, accusing Prime Minister Modi of 'gross misuse of office in personally orchestrating purchase of 36 Rafale while scuttling a deal for 126 aircraft...and his storm-troopers issuing lie after lie'.

The following conversations are recalled: Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar said to Doordarshan: "Modiji took the decision, I backed it up" he said three days after Modi's surprise announcement in Paris on April 10, 2015. Foreign Secretary, S Jaishankar briefed the media on April 8 and said, "Prime Minister does not get involved in ongoing defence contracts." The fourth Defence Minister, new to her job, Nirmala Sitharaman in November 2017 asked Defence Secretary Sanjay Mitra during a media conference to spell out the cost details, which he did not or could not do, whereas comprehensive off the record briefings on costs had already been done by MoD officials in 2016 after signing of the contract and later, spelt out by both Ministers in Parliament.

On July 20, 2018, during the no-confidence motion debate, Sitharaman waved an expired confidentiality agreement with Dassault in

Parliament to protect details of the cost. The Government has tied itself in knots on cost and 14 India-specific enhancements, insisting that their Rafale is nine per cent cheaper, whereas the Opposition is asking how the price helicopter from ₹670 crore to ₹1,660 crore. Five main issues are repeating: Cost and scam; reduction of aircraft numbers from seven squadrons to two squadrons; forfeiture of ToT

and Make in India; sidelining of Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL); and awarding off-sets to Anil Ambani. The first allegation can only be resolved by CAG/CVC. The key issue is enhancing the combat capability of the Indian Air Force (IAF). If the Government had secured a cost-effective deal, why did it order only two and not three or four Rafale squadrons, the Congress is asking? According to NDTV, letters were exchanged between two Defence Ministers about ordering additional Rafales, like was done for Mirage 2000.

In an absurd claim, Sitharaman justifying the Government's contract for two squadrons — based on precedent — told the media that IAF cannot absorb more than two squadrons due to lack of infrastructure and other technical considerations. This is churlish as sufficient time of six to seven years is available to create infrastructure worth-while 1,500 km apart at Ambala and Hashimira.

Equally preposterous is the Minister's claim in an interview to the PTI, denouncing HAL for its lack of capacity to build a Rafale. Former head of HAL, Swarna Raju, has countered this by saying that they have made over 2,000 aircraft — 250 Vampires, 300 Gnats, 700 MIG 21s, 165 MIG 27s, 115 Jaguars, 99 Hawks, 272 Sukhois and 150 Dorniers. A public critique of HAL will do little good to its morale and reputation. On offsets, much has been said by Sitharaman, Hollande and Dassault. Dassault is certainly free to select its

Indian offset partner but the Defence Ministry has to vet the choice.

The most tragic part of the ongoing debate is the Government's politicisation of the IAF — this after the Army's surgical strikes were being used as vote-catcher. Senior IAF officers were unusually used during a seminar on IAF Force structures 2035 to defend the Government's stand on Rafale with journalists from Print and electronic media outnumbering analysts. But questions on Rafale by the media were stonewalled. Journalists whiskered by the media were sidelined. The internecine campaign of Press conferences must stop by the Government agreeing to a JPC. Sitharaman, while rejecting the JPC, wanted a probe as to why 126 aircraft deal could not be consummated during the UPA era, suggesting ministers' involvement.

In a Swachh Bharat, the Government and the Opposition washing their dirty linen in public does no good to national security, especially for a Government which advocates Sabka Sath Sabka Vikas. But sadly, modernisation and other grievances of the military were sidelined. The internecine campaign of Press conferences must stop by the Government agreeing to a JPC. Sitharaman, while rejecting the JPC, wanted a probe as to why 126 aircraft deal could not be consummated during the UPA era, suggesting ministers' involvement.

Insulting the workforce at HAL, insinuating counter scams by injecting the AgustaWestland appear to be diversionary tactics obfuscating procedural deviations as if there was something to hide. The Italian court has ruled out fraud and bribes in the AgustaWestland case.

Instead of 126 Make in India, 36 Rafale will be made in France, surrendering vital ToT. In order to fast track numbers of combat squadrons, the shortfall from the cancelled 126 aircraft contract in July 2015, the Government has had to repeat the MMRCA 2007 tender process in April 2018 for 110 multi-role fighters incurring time and cost escalation. What the UPA was unable to do, the NDA should have done — the last mile in the marathon. But instead Modi allegedly short-circuited established procedures for emergency purchase of 36 Rafale. In the political slugfest, the IAF is left high and dry. It is intriguing how Dassault chief Eric Trappier having said on March 14, 2015, days before Prime Minister Modi's Paris announcement, that he expected the contract to be signed shortly with HAL collaboration, changed his mind.

After the Hollande Rafale revelation, it seems either a former French President or an incumbent Indian Prime Minister (who is still silent) is being economical with the truth. Introducing foreign hand is a fatigued ploy. Coming clean on Rafale should lead to a truce which is urgently required for the IAF to resume breathing normally and India's emerging power reputation not being dented any further.

Mayawati's growing clout

The execution of a grand alliance against the Bharatiya Janata Party for the 2019 Lok Sabha poll looks tough

Who says Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) supreme Mayawati does not dream big? After losing three back-to-back Assembly and Lok Sabha polls in Uttar Pradesh, after getting zero seats in the current Lok Sabha, she still has not given up her ambition of becoming the first Dalit Prime Minister of this country. It may be premature to talk of a bid, but nursing this ambition for long, Mayawati herself thundered in 2012 during an election rally: "I hold the master key to power". In 2014, the BSP declared her as its prime ministerial candidate.

The BSP's national executive passed resolutions in May this year, announcing Mayawati as the prime ministerial candidate for the 2019 General Election. She is not doing it without a purpose as these projections are meant to galvanise the party cadres, selling them the dream of a 7dth left reaching the top. The bottom line is that she should at least emerge as a kingmaker in the post-poll scenario after 2019.

Interestingly, despite her party's downward turn, political parties are vying with each other to tie up with the BSP for the simple reason that the party's votes are transferable. While it may be a million-dollar question whether she will achieve her ambition, her relevance in the grand plans for Opposition unity cannot be questioned. Even the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) is not averse to an alliance with the BSP.

The BSP has presence in 18 States and is the third-largest party after the Congress and the BJP if one goes by the vote share. In 2014, despite not getting a single seat, it secured 19.8 per cent votes in Uttar Pradesh and more than 4.5 per cent popular votes in Madhya Pradesh and Uttarakhand, besides getting respectable vote shares in Karnataka, Punjab, Delhi, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh. Mayawati's clout had increased after she supported the Samajwadi Party (SP) in the Gorakhpur and Phulpur bypolls, which showed that a united Opposition could eas-

ily defeat the BJP. A similar pre-poll alliance with the JD(S) in Karnataka showed the success of a united Opposition. There were expectations that this might be carried over to the year-end Assembly polls as well as the 2019 Lok Sabha election.

However, instead of going for the ensuing Assembly polls in Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh — all BJP-ruled States facing strong anti-incumbency. A defeat or victory will go a long way for both the BJP and the Congress. Dalits account for more than 17 per cent of the votes in Rajasthan, 15. 2 per cent of the total electorate in Madhya Pradesh and nearly 12 per cent in Chhattisgarh. The three States together account for 65 Lok Sabha seats.

The BSP polled 3.5 per cent votes in Rajasthan, 6.3 per cent in Madhya Pradesh and 4.25 per cent in Chhattisgarh in the 2013 Assembly elections. Thus, Mayawati is in a bargaining position.

However, instead of going for a grand alliance, which the Congress was hoping for, Mayawati dashed their hopes in Chhattisgarh by aligning with former Chief Minister Aijit Jogi, who had left the Congress and formed his own Janata Congress. Mayawati has shown that she is unpredictable and will not blindly join the anti-BJP front. It is a double snub to the Congress that she chose to align with Aijit Jogi. As a second blow in Madhya Pradesh, the BSP has decided to contest all seats even while the Congress was dilly-dallying about the seat sharing formula.

(September 25). It appears that in their respective handling of the Rafale affair, while the Congress is getting desperate, the NDA is getting awkward day by day.



Killing two birds with one stone

India's water crisis calls for immediate action. Situation analysis of the manufacturing of antimicrobials (AMR) and strict implementation of existing policies is the way forward

A report by the Government's think-tank, Niti Aayog, titled, "Composite Water Management Index: A Tool for Water Management", released in June this year, warned that India is facing its "worst" water crisis in history. Further, it states that by 2030, water demand in the country is projected to be twice the available water supply unless comprehensive steps are taken to reverse the current scenario. Substantiating the positive relationship between water stress and economic growth, the report highlights that water scarcity will lead to a six per cent GDP loss to the country. The issue of sustainable management of our water resources is an essential need today, especially in view of its limited availability and rising demand.

Other than inefficient usage and over consumption, one key factor leading to water crisis is industrial pollution. Water bodies stand endangered due to unbridled dumping of toxic industrial waste. Recent reports around pollutants causing methane fires in Bengaluru's Bellandur lake; release of untreated industrial waste into Yamuna and Musi rivers, Maharashtra's Ambazari lake as well as the choking of Hyderabad's Patancheru lake by the bulk drug industry, are testament to this. As a result, no city is able to provide clean drinking water due to water contamination and inadequate wastewater treatment. This unabated crisis can severely hamper India's industrial, environmental and economic health.

A crucial but often ignored consequence of water pollution is a rise in antimicrobial resistance (AMR). Multiple studies conducted by Norda, IIT Hyderabad etc.) around pharmaceutical industries near Hyderabad, Bhiwadi and Vizag, have shown that copious amounts of antibiotics are being released as wastewater into the surrounding water bodies. These serve as "hotspots" for the development of resistant superbugs that do not respond to antibiotic treatment, causing untreatable infections and diseases. The proliferation of antibiotic residues in the environment, due to inadequate regulation of wastewater, leads to contamination of water sources and groundwater. Moreover, a plethora of bacterial infections or diseases, caused by a lack of access to clean water and sanitation or poor Wash standards, gives rise to increased antibiotic consumption, which is compounded by inappropriate self-medication.

As per a 2016 World Bank report, 'Drug Resistant Infections: A Threat to our Economic Future', inability to treat infections will not only cost human lives, but will also result in GDP losses of over five per cent in low-income countries and push 28 million people in developing countries into poverty by 2050, thereby causing a crisis potentially worse than the 2008 economic meltdown. Global health care costs may increase to \$300 billion to one trillion dollar, annually. The regulation of wastewater treatment can be a cost-effective means to prevent AMR as well as alleviate the water crisis, provided efforts are made to ensure that both sets of measures are sufficiently interlinked. In the Indian context, more research needs to be done to obtain actionable information and understand the complex linkages between the environment, AMR and Wash standards.

There have been some policy interventions related to the overuse or misuse of antibiotics in human and animal consumption. Overall waste management by industries must be monitored by the State pollution control boards. However, existing regulations need effective enforcement. Moreover, sufficient attention is not given to irresponsible manufacturing of antibiotics and uncontrolled release of active antibiotics via wastewater. Existing environmental regulations account for the presence of heavy metals in water but there are no minimum standards for the levels of APIs (active pharmaceutical ingredients) in the discharged industrial effluents. Thus, pharmaceutical industries are not mandated to treat the antibiotic content in the wastewater released during the manufacturing processes.

In order to strengthen the policy focus on the AMR challenge in India, and establish it as a State-level priority, the health ministry launched the National Action Programme on the Containment of Antimicrobial Resistance (NAP-AMR) in April 2017. The scheme recognises the need to mandate environmental standards for antibiotic residues in pharmaceutical and hospital effluents. The NGT has ordered a status report to determine the AMR levels in water bodies as an impact of the pharmaceutical industry but this has been delayed due to lack of funds. In adherence to the NAP-AMR, this dual AMR and water crisis in India demands immediate action towards a situation analysis of the manufacturing of antimicrobials as well as increased surveillance standards, alongside strict policy advocacy and implementation. The development of specific antibiotic policies, supported by sensitisation and awareness workshops can drive home the magnitude of this dual challenge. Such interventions can help shape frameworks for participation by other relevant stakeholders. Any gaps in adequate policy responses vis-à-vis regulations, monitoring and implementation will result in severe economic and environmental impacts as well as loss of human lives.



Bad debts on decline, bank loan recovery up: Jaitley

Finance Minister Arun Jaitley on Tuesday said bad debts or NPAs in the banking system are on the decline as recoveries of unpaid loans have picked up.

Speaking to reporters after the annual review meet with top PSU bankers, he said last several years had been challenging for public sector banks as a large amount of lending was held up in NPAs.

But after the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) came into force, which calls for an auction of assets of loan defaulting entities, recoveries have picked up. Recoveries are better, the lending ability of banks is much better and to top it all credit growth has significantly moved upwards, he said.

"We are passing through a phase of good growth as far as the economy is concerned. Consumption has moved up, and therefore the banking activity is bound to pick up", he said. Financial Services Secretary Rajeev Kumar said banks expect to recover ₹1.8 lakh crore through IBC and other routes during the current fiscal.

JAITLEY ASKS PSU BANKS TO TAKE EFFECTIVE ACTION AGAINST FRAUDS, WILFUL DEFAULTS

Finance Minister Arun Jaitley Tuesday asked public sector banks (PSBs) to take "effective action" in cases of fraud and wilful loan defaults, as he exuded confidence of achieving sustained economic growth rate of 8 per cent.

The growing economy will also help banks grow in strength, he said at the annual review meeting of PSBs here.

Conversely, as the lifeline of the economy, banks would need to build their strength to support the lending needs of a growing economy, he added, according to an official release.

"At the same time", he exhorted the banks "to ensure all steps at their end to ensure clean lending and effective action in cases of fraud and wilful default, to justify the trust reposed in banks. Banks must strive to be seen always as institutions of clean and prudent lending".

The meeting is taking place in the backdrop of the 'Alternative Mechanism' (AM) deciding to merge three public sector banks — Bank of Baroda, Vijaya Bank and Dena Bank — with a view to create a global-size lender which would be stronger and sustainable.

Banks have stepped up efforts as far as recovery of bad loans is concerned.

Lenders have made recovery of ₹36,551 crore in the first quarter of the current fiscal. This is 49 per cent higher than the same quarter of the last fiscal. During 2017-18, banks recovered ₹74,562 crore.

Jaitley said the formalisation of the economy through the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC), GST, demonetisation and digital payments have enabled better assessment of financial capacity and risks, and coupled with inclusive growth through massive financial inclusion, has unlocked purchasing power which will drive India's growth.

The finance minister said that "this should help India sustain a growth rate of around 8 per cent".

Cabinet may change GSTN into a Govt entity today

The Union Cabinet is likely to consider on Wednesday the proposal to convert GST Network (GSTN) into a Government-owned company.

The GST Council, chaired by Union Finance Minister Arun Jaitley and comprising state finance ministers, had in May agreed to a proposal to make GSTN a Government company, with Centre owning 50 per cent stake and states together holding the remaining 50 per cent.

"Converting GSTN to a government company may be considered by the Cabinet tomorrow," a source said.

Currently, the Centre and states together hold 49 per cent stake in GST Network, the company that provides IT backbone to the new indirect tax regime. The remaining 51 per cent is held by five private financial institutions — HDFC Ltd, HDFC Bank Ltd, ICICI Bank Ltd, NSE Strategic Investment Co and LIC Housing Finance Ltd.

Jaitley had in April asked Finance Secretary Hasmukh Adhia to "examine the possibility" of converting GSTN into a majority Government company or a 100 per cent Government company.

Govt finances show improvement in August

Government's finances have shown improvement in August with fiscal deficit at 94.7 per cent of the Budget Estimate (BE), mainly on account of better expenditure management, as per an official data.

The deficit was at 96.1 per cent of BE at August-end of the last financial year.

In actual terms, the fiscal deficit or gap between the total expenditure and receipts was ₹5.91 lakh crore in the first five months period of 2018-19 financial year.

The Government has budgeted to cut fiscal deficit to 3.3 per cent of GDP in 2018-19 from 3.53 per cent in the previous year.

The fiscal deficit target for 2018-19 is ₹6.24 lakh crore.

As per the data released by the Controller General of Accounts (CGA), the tax collection (net) at end-August was ₹3.66 lakh crore or 24.7 per cent of BE.

The total receipts of the Government during April-August 2018 were ₹4.79 lakh crore or 26.4 per cent of BE. In the similar period of 2017-18, the collection was 26.6 per cent of BE.

RBI needs to cut CRR to improve liquidity: Official

The RBI should consider lowering Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) in addition to buying Government bonds to ensure adequate liquidity, an official said on Tuesday.

Concerned over volatility in the stock markets, the Reserve Bank and markets regulator Sebi had on Sunday said they were closely monitoring the developments in the financial sector and were ready to take appropriate actions.

"The RBI has tools like OMO (Open Market Operations) to manage liquidity. Also a CRR cut would ensure immediate liquidity in the market," the Government official told reporters.

The focus should now be on ensuring adequate liquidity in the system and "not jammung" the credit flow, he added.

CRR, the percentage of deposits that banks have to park with the RBI in cash, currently stands at 4 per cent.

The central bank has kept the CRR unchanged since September 2013.

Instagram co-founders resigning: report

Facebook did not respond to a request for comment.

Instagram in June announced it passed a billion active users, and unveiled a new long-form video feature in a bid to attract "creators" like those on YouTube.

Rupee losses widen, down 6 paise at 72.69 against USD

The rupee on Tuesday weakened further by 6 paise to close at 72.69 to the US dollar on sustained demand for the American currency amid soaring crude prices.

It was a highly volatile day on the forex market as wide swings in the currency value kept investors on edge and precluded the emergence of a clear trend.

A further sharp spike in international crude oil prices due to a combination of factors and bullish dollar overseas trend ahead of Federal Reserve's two-day policy meet kept trading sentiment little shaky.

The Indian currency dangerously slipped to a low of 72.96 in early trade — within striking distance of its life-time low of 72.99 hit last week but managed to pare some losses on likely intervention from the central bank.

It briefly touched a high of 72.57 in mid-afternoon deals. The rupee has lost 49 paise in last two days.

Heavy dollar selling by banks and exporters along with greenbank's weakness against some currencies overseas largely supplemented the recovery momentum.

A spectacular bull back rally in domestic bourses after five straight-day pounding on the back of value buying in beaten-down key stocks and hectic short-covering ahead of expiry also helped in propping up the currency.

The currency markets worldwide are rattled with over-lapping geopolitical factors rubbing shoulder against each other and also underpinned by the divergent monetary policy outlooks against major global central banks, a forex dealer commented.

The US Fed is likely to stay on course and hike interest rates by 25 basis points (bps) tomorrow.

Stocks end 5-day losing streak, gain 347 points

Market benchmark Sensex Tuesday bounced back by 347 points to end its five-day losing streak helped by a recovery in banking, pharma and FMCG stocks.

The 30-share index closed at 36,652.06, up by 347.04 points or 0.96 per cent in a volatile trade. It touched a high of 36,705.79 and a low of 36,064.10 in day trade.

The 50-share NSE Nifty ended sharply higher by 100.05 points, or 0.91 per cent, at 11,067.45 points. Intra-day, it shuttled between 11,080.60 and 10,882.85.

A recovery in financial stocks led by HDFC and HDFC Bank helped the key indices break the five-day losing streak which saw the Sensex tanking 1,785.62 points or more than 5 per cent.

Kotak Bank, Axis Bank, SBI, IndusInd Bank and ICICI Bank also bounced back on positive sentiment after LIC chairman V K Sharma commented that the insurance giant would not allow debt-ridden IL&FS to collapse and was exploring options to revive it.

Reports of successful fundraising by Indiabulls Housing Finance also bolstered the market sentiment, analysts said. "After a volatile trade,

market bounced back towards closing backed by renewed buying in financial & pharma stocks. Continued weakness in rupee invited investors' attention towards export-oriented sectors and at the same time keeping fiscal path on edge. Domestic fund flow continued to add liquidity in the market due to value buying opportunity after the recent correction," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services commented.

Mixed Asian cues and a firming trend in European markets largely on the back of strong earnings accelerated buying activity towards the day-end.

The session was marked by volatility and stock-specific action, even as the overall sentiment remains weak as a fresh round of US-China tariffs and a surge in oil prices to near four-year highs added to worries about risks to global growth, brokers said.

The rupee also pared initial losses to trade 5 paise higher at 72.58 against the dollar (intra-day).

Covering-up of short positions by speculators ahead of September month expiry in the derivatives segment on Thursday also helped the market stage a smart rally.

Domestic investors made

purchases worth ₹2,284.26 crore while foreign investors sold equities worth ₹1,231.70 crore on a net basis, provisional market data showed.

Axis Bank was the biggest gainer in the Sensex pack, surging 2.96 per cent, followed by HDFC at 2.95 per cent.

Other gainers were Kotak Bank 2.88 per cent, HUL 2.72 per cent, Maruti Suzuki 2.66 per cent, Sun Pharma 2.58 per cent, SBI 2.15 per cent, Asian Paint 1.91 per cent, HDFC Bank 1.32 per cent, Infosys 1.28 per cent, Bajaj Auto 1.15 per cent, IndusInd Bank 1.10 per cent, NTPC 1.07 per cent, ITC Ltd 1.06 per cent, ONGC 1.05 per cent, Bharti Airtel 0.73 per cent, Vedanta 0.46 per cent, ICICI Bank 0.45 per cent and Tata Motors 0.27 per cent.

In contrast, Yes Bank remained distinctly weak by crashing 2.83 per cent ahead of the board meeting to be held later in the day to decide the future course of action after the RBI curtailed the term of its MD and CEO Rana Kapoor.

Also, PowerGrid suffered the most by falling 3.07 per cent, Coal India 1.94 per cent, Adani Ports 1.65 per cent, Tata Steel 1.10 per cent, Wipro 0.93 per cent, TCS 0.71 per cent, M&M 0.22 per cent, Hero MotoCorp 0.14 per cent and RIL 0.14 per cent.

FDI in food processing touches USD 1-billion mark: Badal

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

The foreign direct investment (FDI) in the food processing sector has already touched the USD 1-billion mark so far this year, Food Processing Minister Harsimrat Kaur Badal said Tuesday. "When we took over the government in 2014, FDI in the food processing sector used to be USD 500 million every year. This year, we touched USD 1-billion mark.

This is a tip of the iceberg, we have to go a long way," Badal said addressing the CII event on post harvest and logistics. According to official data, FDI in the food processing sector was USD 904.9 million in the 2017-18 fiscal, while it stood at USD 727.22 million, USD 505.88 million and USD 515.86 million in 2016-17, 2015-16 and 2014-15, respectively.

The FDI in multi-brand retail was allowed keeping in mind the need to boost food processing level and provide an alternative market to farmers to sell their produce, she said.

The focus was to see retailers directly procure farm produce from farmers. "I am happy to see companies like Metro and Walmart are keen to tie up directly with farmers."

About USD 14 billion that was committed during the World Food India 2017 for next few years, the minister said. "I am happy to share that 70 per cent of the projects have already started the grounding."

This will help grow the processing levels and reduce food wastage which is estimated to be ₹1 lakh crore per year, she said.

Talking about domestic investment, National Rainfed Area Authority (NREA) CEO Ashok Dalwai said, "We have seen that the captive investment in agriculture,

which is pre-requisite for any kind of accelerated growth, has not really happened through the corporate sector."

While the private investments have largely been through farmers themselves, the corporate sector which should have played a greater role has not really done so, he said.

Dalwai said the corporate sector cannot be blamed as the government -- which should have been the trigger in bringing the investment in the private sector -- has not tailored the policy that suits its requirement.

Also, there has been captive investment in industry and services sector since liberalisation in 1991.

"Agriculture, which is the primary economic activity and in a way it is the economic sector which generates the demand for services and industry sectors, was not subjected to the liberalisation. But in the last four years, the emphasis has been on bringing in reforms in the sector and make it a private sector enterprise," Dalwai said. The government has been focusing on post harvest management and logistics, he added.

DUCATI DRIVES IN 959 PANIGALE CORSE AT ₹15.2 LAKH

New Delhi: Italian super bike maker Ducati Tuesday launched the 959 Panigale Corse in India priced at ₹15.2 lakh (ex-showroom). The model coming to India is a special edition, sporting a dedicated livery inspired by the Ducati Corse MotoGP colours, the company said in a statement. "The 959 Panigale embodies absolute excellence through the advanced electronics package that inspires confidence and allows riders to explore the limit," Ducati India Managing Director Sergi Canovas said. The bike comes with a 955-cc engine which generates a power of 157 HP of power. It comes with an electronics package, including latest ABS from Bosch, Ducati traction control (DTC), Ducati quick shift (DQS), engine brake control (EBC) and ride-by-wire (RbW). It also features three riding modes -- Race, Sport and Wet.

TRIUMPH PLANS NETWORK EXPANSION IN INDIA

New Delhi: British superbike brand Triumph Motorcycles plans to introduce in India around six products, a mix of new models and upgrades of current bikes, by June next year, a top company official said Tuesday. The company, which sells superbikes priced between ₹7.7-22 lakh in the country, also aims to expand its sales network from the current 16 dealerships to 25 over the next 3-4 years with an aim to reach smaller towns as well. "Before June 2019, we plan to launch six products. It would be a mix of new and facelifts of the current models," Triumph Motorcycles (India) General Manager Shoaib Farooq told PTI. Triumph Motorcycles (India), which follows July-June financial year, sells 13 models, including variants, in the Indian market. It gets 65-70 per cent of its sales from top 20 cities of the country although its customer footprint spreads across 400 cities and towns across India. Among the new launches, Triumph plans to drive in 1,200 cc Triumph Scrambler, which will make global debut in October, into the Indian market in January next year. Elaborating on the sales growth target during the current fiscal, Farooq said the company expects to grow in the range of 10-12 per cent. "In the last five years, the premium motorcycle segment (500 cc and upwards) has been growing at a CAGR of 20 per cent as compared to around 6-7 per cent for the normal two-wheelers. For Triumph, the growth has been at 47 per cent in the last five years," he added. The premium segment industry is around 7,500 units a year and Triumph had about 20 per cent market share last fiscal. Bullish on the growth prospects, Farooq said in the next four to five years, the industry is expected to grow at 10-15 per cent touching a size of around 13,000 units a year. "We (Triumph) should be doing not less than 2,000 units per year," he added. On the potential for growth from smaller cities and towns, he said: "Today, Triumph has customer footprints in 400 cities and towns across India but around 60 per cent of the sales comes from the top 20 cities."

Afghanistan: A self-proclaimed cleric in Afghanistan, who allegedly filmed himself having sex with women, is on the run after the videos went viral on social media, prompting religious leaders to order his death by stoning. Mullah Rasool, a traditional healer who wrote amulets for clients in a village in the northwestern province of Faryab, is accused of sexually exploiting and raping several women who had gone to him for help.

TRUMP SAYS US WILL ONLY GIVE AID 'TO OUR FRIENDS'
United Nations: President Donald Trump said Tuesday that the United States would only give aid to countries that it regarded as allies. "We will examine what is working, what is not working, and whether the countries who receive our dollars and our protection also have our interests at heart," Trump said in a speech at the United Nations General Assembly.

US IMPOSES SANCTIONS ON VENEZUELAN PRESIDENT'S WIFE
Washington: The US Treasury Department announced Tuesday it is imposing sanctions on the wife, vice president and other close associates of Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro's inner circle. Treasury named Cilija Adela Flores de Maduro, a former attorney general and the president's wife, as one of the figures who has helped Maduro retain his grip on power, along with Vice President Delcy Rodriguez.

Israel to keep fighting Iran in Syria, coordinating with Russia: Netanyahu

Jerusalem: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu pledged Tuesday to continue combatting Iranian "entrenchment" in Syria and coordinating with Russia after the downing of one of Moscow's planes. "We will continue to act to prevent the Iranian military entrenchment in Syria, and continue the security coordination between the Israel Defence Forces and Russian army," Netanyahu told reporters. On September 17, Syrian air defences mistakenly shot down a Russian military plane following an Israeli raid in Syria, killing 15 people. Moscow has blamed the friendly fire incident on Israeli pilots using the larger Russian plane as "cover". Israel disputes the Russian findings and says its jets were back in Israeli airspace when the plane was downed. Russia announced new security measures to protect its military in Syria, including supplying the Syrian army with an S-300 air defence system and jamming radars of nearby warplanes. Those moves prompted Netanyahu on Monday to warn Putin against "transferring advanced weapons systems into irresponsible hands". Speaking at the airport before travelling to New York for the United Nations General Assembly, Netanyahu stressed Israel's "great success" in preventing Iranian military entrenchment in Syria and the transfer of advanced arms to Hezbollah in Lebanon over the past three years. Iran video threatens missile strikes on UAE, Saudi Arabia

An Iranian media outlet close to the country's hard-line Revolutionary Guard published a video Tuesday threatening the Capitals of Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates with missile attacks, further raising regional tensions after a weekend militant attack on a military parade in Iran. The video tweeted and later deleted by the semi-official Fars news agency comes as Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei blamed Riyadh and Abu Dhabi for the attack in the city of Ahvaz on Saturday that killed at least 25 people and wounded over 60. The threat amplifies the unease felt across the greater Persian Gulf, which is seeing Iran's economy upended in the wake of America's withdrawal from Tehran's nuclear deal with world powers and Saudi and Emirati forces bogged down in their years-long war in Yemen. The video shows live footage of previous ballistic missile attacks launched by the Guard, then a graphic of a sniper rifle scope homing in on Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates and Riyadh in Saudi Arabia. The video also threatened Israel. "The era of the hit-and-run has expired," Khamenei's voice is heard in the video, the segment taken from an April speech by the supreme leader. "A heavy punishment is underway." Iran has fired its ballistic missiles twice in anger in recent years. In 2017, responding to an Islamic State attack on Tehran, the Guard fired missiles striking targets in Syria. Then, earlier this month, it launched a strike on a meeting of Iranian Kurdish separatists in northern Iraq. The Guard, a paramilitary force answerable only to Khamenei, has sole control over Iran's ballistic missile program. Under Khamenei's orders, Iran now limits its ballistic missiles to a range of 2,000 kilometers, which gives Tehran the range to strike Israel, Gulf countries like Saudi Arabia and the UAE, as well as regional American military bases. Saturday's attack targeted one of many parades in Iran marking the start of the country's long 1980s war with Iraq, part of a commemoration known as "Sacred Defense Week". Militants disguised as soldiers opened fire as rows of troops marched past officials in Ahvaz. Arab separatists in the region claimed the attack and Iranian officials have blamed them for the assault. The separatists accuse Iran's Persian-dominated government of discriminating against its ethnic Arab minority.

Give enabling condition, stick to FTA: China tells Maldives

A wary China on Tuesday hoped that the Maldives' new Government will provide an "enabling environment" to Chinese companies and stick to the controversial Free Trade Agreement (FTA) Beijing had signed with the now outgoing President Abdulla Yameen. China congratulated the Maldives for holding successful elections in which Ibrahim Mohamed Solih of the Maldivian Democratic Party (MDP) defeated incumbent Yameen, perceived to be close to Beijing. The MDP was critical of increased Chinese investment and the FTA which was rushed through the country's Parliament without debate last year. "China congratulates the Maldives on its successful Presidential election and as well as Solih's victory. We respect Maldives people's choice and we hope the country can maintain stability and development," Foreign Ministry spokesperson Geng Shuang said. "As to the FTA signed between China and the Maldives, we believe we have always encouraged the Chinese to invest and operate in accordance with the market-based rules and the regulations. "And we hope the Maldives will maintain consistency and stability of their policy and create an enabling environment and atmosphere for the Chinese operation there," Geng added. "China and Maldives signed an FTA. China will work with the Maldives to ensure the sound implementation of FTA and expand trade and investment cooperation between both the sides for the greater benefit and development of people of both the nations," Geng said. The Chinese Ministry later clarified that the FTA was yet to come into effect. Geng was responding to a question on whether China was worried over the election of the new government which might renegotiate deals signed by Yameen's government. The Maldives sits on one of the world's busiest shipping lanes in the Indian Ocean where both India and China vie for influence. The Maldives has always been a traditional ally of India. But under Yameen's presidency, the country moved closer to China, worrying New Delhi. China, which didn't even have an embassy in Male until 2011, has stepped up its engagement in the country by building bridges, airport and high-end housing complexes.

Kavanaugh denies sexual misconduct allegations, says never assaulted anyone

US President Donald Trump's Supreme Court nominee Judge Brett Kavanaugh has said that he "never sexually assaulted anyone" and always treated women with dignity and respect, as he sought a fair process to defend his "integrity" over the mounting sexual misconduct allegations that have put his confirmation into jeopardy. Two women - Christine Blasey Ford and Deborah Ramirez - have come out publicly in the last 10 days, alleging that they were sexually assaulted by Kavanaugh 36 and 25 years ago respectively. "I have never sexually assaulted anyone, not in high school, not ever. I have always treated women with dignity and respect," Kavanaugh said on Monday as he broke his long silence on the issue. "Listen to the people who have known me best through my whole life, the women who have known me since high school, the 65 who overnight signed a letter from high school, saying I always treated them with dignity and respect..." he told Fox News as he gave his first interview along with his wife. "I am looking for a fair process, a process where I can defend my integrity and clear my name. And all I am asking for is fairness and that I'd be heard in this process," Kavanaugh, 53, said. Kavanaugh and his first accuser 51-year-old Ford, a professor at Palo Alto University, are scheduled to testify before the Senate Judiciary Committee on Thursday. The Democrats are asking for an FBI investigation into the incident, which so far has been stonewalled by the Republicans and President Trump.

Pakistan unlikely to change its behaviour over terrorism: Haqqani

Washington: The Pakistani leadership defines terrorism differently than the US Government and is unlikely to act against all terrorist groups as demanded by Washington, Pakistan's former Ambassador to America Husain Haqqani has said. In an article in the journal 'American Interest', Haqqani said that Pakistani leaders' view of their country's interests in Afghanistan, differ vastly from those of the US and that limits the prospects of cooperation in ending the Afghan war. "Pakistan's leadership defines terrorism differently than the US government and thus is unlikely to act against all terrorist groups, as (Secretary of State) Mike Pompeo demanded," Haqqani, who is now the Director for South and Central Asia at Washington-based Hudson Institute, said. Pakistan's Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi is scheduled to meet Pompeo on October 2 to further discussions. PTI

Trump says he wants to hold second summit with Kim

Washington: US President Donald Trump has said he expects to hold a second summit with North Korean leader Kim Jong-un "in the not too distant future" over the progress in the denuclearisation of the Korean Peninsula and praised him for being "very open and terrific". The two leaders held their first historic meeting in Singapore in June but the details of their agreement over disarmament were vague, with no timeline or indication on how the steps towards denuclearisation would be achieved. "I am going to be meeting with Chairman Kim in the not-too-distant future. The location is being worked on, the time is being worked on, and we will be announcing it," Trump told reporters during a meeting with his South Korean counterpart Moon Jae-In in New York on the sidelines of the annual UN General Assembly. PTI

US documents systematic violence against Myanmar Rohingya

United Nations: The US said Monday it had found evidence of systematic violence by Myanmar's military against the Rohingya minority, including widespread killings and rape. The State Department released the report just as the US announced USD 185 million in new funding for Rohingya refugees during a meeting at the United Nations on Myanmar. The State Department study, based on interviews in April with 1,024 Rohingya adults who have taken refuge in neighbouring Bangladesh, provided accounts consistent with reports from human rights groups but kept largely to dispassionate descriptions of events. The report notably did not use the terms genocide or ethnic cleansing to describe the mass killings of the Rohingya, a mostly Muslim group concentrated in Rakhine state that is despised by many in Buddhist-majority Myanmar and who are not considered citizens. PTI

First Sikh guardsman tests positive for cocaine, could be expelled from UK Army

London: A 22-year-old Sikh soldier, who created history by becoming the first to wear a turban during an annual parade to mark British Queen Elizabeth II's birthday ceremony, could be kicked out from his post after he was tested positive for cocaine, according to a media report. Charanpreet Singh Lall made headlines across the world for wearing the turban during the Trooping the Colour in June. However, last week he failed a random drugs test at his barracks, with insiders claiming he registered "high levels" of cocaine, *The Sun* reported. "Guardsman Lall has been discussing it openly in the barracks. The Guards carry out public duties at the Palace, it's disgraceful behaviour," a source was quoted as saying by the report. "It is for his commanding officer to decide if he gets the boot - but anyone caught taking Class A drugs can expect to be dismissed." PTI

Nearly 170 activists charged with forming 'Bahrain Hezbollah'

Dubai: Bahrain's attorney general charged nearly 170 activists on Tuesday with forming a Shia "terrorist organisation" named after Lebanon's famed Islamist movement Hezbollah. The small but strategic Gulf Arab kingdom has been dogged by persistent low-level violence since 2011 when its Sunni minority rulers bloodily suppressed Shia-led peaceful protests for a constitutional monarchy with an elected Prime Minister. The authorities have repeatedly accused Islamic Republic of Iran and its allies, including Hezbollah, of fomenting the unrest. Iran denies the charge. Attorney General Ahmad al-Hamadi said 169 people, 111 of whom are in custody, will be tried for "forming a terrorist organisation... Under the name Bahrain Hezbollah" in collaboration with the Iranian intelligence services. Hamadi did not specify when the trial would open or when the defendants had been arrested. But he said some of them were accused of travelling abroad to receive training in weapons and explosives from Iran and its regional allies. Analysts have expressed scepticism about previous Bahraini allegations of Iranian and Hezbollah involvement. Hezbollah is one of the best trained and equipped militant groups in the world, while most of the Bahrain violence has consisted of throwing stones and petrol bombs at police patrols or planting crude pipe bombs. The authorities have closed most peaceful avenues for protest, banning the main Shia Islamist movement Al-Wefaq, which was the largest bloc in parliament, and throwing dozens of its leaders behind bars. AP

Courses like BVoc in Entrepreneurship Skills empower aspiring entrepreneurs to be job creators rather than jobseekers. These courses mentor them to start and run a business, says **DR RAJENDRA KUMAR JOSHI**



Ajay, a middle-class boy from Jaipur, was clear while choosing a skill university with a goal to master the skills needed to start his own establishment. But, he was confused as about the skill he should consider and also how to start his enterprise.

Many of us have the same dreams, but to follow them, we follow a lengthy approach which is to first graduate and then do an MBA. After academics, start exploring the shortlisted ideas, gather information, make feasibility reports, research and analyse the market in every possible way; everything by ourselves. After doing everything, there's still hesitation as it is his first venture. That's the story most students aspiring to become entrepreneurs.

There is a myth that skills' courses are meant for those who want to join jobs in their chosen skill sets. Aspirants ignore the bigger picture of enterprise development which academia, universities and the Government are trying to address by introducing courses like Bachelor of Vocational Education (BVoc) in entrepreneurship.

The Government has realised the value of start-ups and new entrepreneurial ventures as this is the only way to outperform on the global stage. India is home to 3,100 start-ups per year, ranking behind the US, the UK and Israel, according to a 2015 NASSCOM report. It is anticipated that India will be home to the 112 million working population in the age group of 20-24 as compared to 94 million in China. So many young brains at work will surely help the entrepreneurship ecosystem to prosper in the nation.

ROAD AHEAD

The sector is expected to grow faster with the Government's thrust to support entrepreneurship in the country. New ideas and employment opportunities with good career growth is on offer to those who join this course.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has issued instructions for offering BVoc, MVoc and PhD in Entrepreneurship Skills in the list of degrees that can be awarded by the universities under Section 22 of the UGC Act. However, over 800 universities in the country are still offering conventional degrees.

All skill universities, namely, Haryana Vishwakarma Skill University (HVSU), Institute of Leadership Development (ILD), Symbiosis Skills and Open University (SSOU), Team Lease Skills University (TLSU), Centurion University, Seacom Skills

University and Bhartiya Skill Development University have come together and formed an association of Indian Skills Universities. The objective is to convert the job seekers into job generators. This course will inculcate the positive attitude, business culture and empower the students to start their micro enterprise.

SKILLS

A focused vocational skill development programme like BVoc in Entrepreneurship Skills will:

- Motivate students towards self-employment through positive Attitude.
- Equip the students with entrepreneurial skills and knowledge.
- Enable students to assess the commercial viability of new/existing business opportunities.
- Encourage students to start a micro enterprise.
- Enable the students to create an entrepreneurial environment by providing jobs.
- Enable the students to secure gainful wage employment if required.
- Permit the students to take up competitive exams of all nature at the Centre and State services like any other graduate.

The role of skill development universities doesn't end by just equipping students with the necessary skills. They also provide mentoring and support after completion of the course. Many institutes have established incubation centres to nurture the business ideas of the aspirant entrepreneurs, extend guidance, mentorship, proper handholding to start and run the business. Skill universities across the nation have tie-ups with their State skill ministry and allied Government bodies to help students in every possible way.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIRED

The eligibility for the programme is Class XII (10+2) passed with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics (PCM). Or Industrial Training Institutes (ITI) after Class X or Polytechnic diploma will be considered as equivalent to 10+2. Looking at the increasing demand, the UGC has now given BVoc courses a status equivalent to a graduation degree and the students after completing BVoc courses can definitely compete for Government jobs. Admission will be through an entrance exam or based on the merit of the qualifying the exam. One of the specialties of the BVoc courses is that they are modular in nature with multiple entry and exit points at certificate (after six months), diploma (after one-year), advanced diploma (after two-years) and BVoc (after three years).

It is a matter of importance for students to select the right avenue at the right time to make a successful professional career.

On the occasion of the upcoming anniversary of Make In India initiative, monster.com has released the *Monster Salary Index (MSI)* report for the Manufacturing sector. At ₹230.9 per hour, Manufacturing is the only sector amongst the eight captured in MSI to see a notable increase (nine per cent) in median gross hourly salary. What's also interesting to note is that the median gross salary in the manufacturing sector in 2017 at ₹230.9 per hour is 5.2 per cent more than the overall median gross salary of India which is ₹219.4 per hour.

In 2017, manufacturing has also been the second highest-earning sector in India and with the exception of the IT sector, manufacturing also remains the

only other sector that paid a median gross salary of above ₹200 per hour threshold.

The report observes that IT sector paid median wage at ₹317.6 per hour, the highest among all monitored sectors, but 17.8 per cent less than the last year. This is one of the reasons why more than half (51 per cent) weren't satisfied with their jobs. Some other aspects contributing to job dissatisfaction are commuting time, work-life balance, and working hours. Interestingly, employees in the IT sector are most satisfied with their relationships at work.

Sharing his views, Abhijeet Mukherjee, CEO, Monster.com, APAC and Gulf, said: "As Industry 4.0 contin-

ues to gain wider acceptance and reshapes the manufacturing industry, India is well positioned to become one of the largest manufacturing economies in the world. The momentum is mirrored by the increased median gross hourly wage recorded for the manufacturing sector in the Monster Salary Index. There are already clear signs of green shoots sprouting in pockets of local manufacturing in sectors as diverse as steel, auto, chemicals and energy and this is also reflected in the 60 per cent year-over-year growth in online hiring in the production and manufacturing sector till July 2018, as reported by Monster Employment Index."

Mukherjee added, "The advent of automation and AI has brought about some uncertainty, but job creation is expected to continue with an impetus on upskilling and re-skilling the current workforce. The IT and BFSI sectors have shown a correction in wages and it isn't surprising that pay satisfaction is low with only over 40 per cent of employees satisfied with their salaries. While these sectors have shown an upward trend in hiring activity as per Monster Employment Index, companies could consider relooking at salaries in these sectors to boost employee satisfaction."



laptops and smartphones is a blessing for educators in this regard. The ability to design online learning platforms which offer smooth experience to students even at low Internet speeds has been an icing on the cake. There are some learning platforms that benefit students from the remote areas of Kashmir, Alleppey, Manali and Nagaland to name a few. Such courses and opportunities have been encouraging for youth who has carved out a new way to learn and grow. CUSTOMER ENGAGEMENT The traditional education method was largely focused on making the students learn everything to make them skilled workers but now this has shifted to ensure that the students are taught to learn basis what they want to learn. This shift in the ultimate aim of education is the result of increased customer engagement on a one to one basis with the educator. Now, students can interact on a one to one basis with their trainers and educators like never before. The rise of Google Plus, YouTube and other free sources of learning on the Internet are an enabler for the students in this, learning on their own process. Once you teach a student how he can teach himself without assistance, he or she can train himself

with any skill required. The increasing demand for skill up courses in professional, through online methods, where they use self-paced, non-classroom methods to train themselves in industry-relevant skills is a huge testament to this fact.

EDUCATORS ARE THE LINK The increasing importance of technology does not in any way mean that the role of teachers or educators has become obsolete. Rather, it has now become even more important. Technology acts as a better enabler which caters to the shift in the consumer behaviour in the education sector, but the key decision-making element is still the content. The availability of free access to content is just an indication that the teachers/educators now need to work harder and create user-specific and up-to-date content. Although Artificial Intelligence (AI) is also being used to act as instructors in some areas, for example, the US Navy has used AI programmes to educate its entry-level IT Professionals. But even if AI develops as a medium of instruction, even it will need skilled educators to program them, so the role of educators with this philosophical shift has become all the more pivotal and crucial.

A WIN-WIN FOR ALL It is not that the need for personalisation or increased customer engagement is a pain to the educators. Rather, this philosophical shift kicked in by technology, is a boon even for the educators. For starters, the cost of course creation and distribution has reduced drastically. It is usually a one-time cost with changes kick-

ing in only when the content needs to be updated. The only place where the cost or where the attention, from the educator's end, has improved, is the need to maintain interpersonal relationships, bringing more skilled and thoughtful educators and better technological interface. But, even then the ROI of educators is now on a rise. Even working professionals and industry experts, with a knack for teaching, are now designing courses and hosting them on these new education portals. They are now fulfilling their longtime dream of contributing to the field of education, without giving up the comforts of their jobs, earning additional revenue and in turn imparting valuable industry knowledge to the students. Students also reap the benefits as more and more self-paced courses on industry-based skills have come up and owing to the lower costs the course fees have seen a major reduction.

ROLE OF INDUSTRY No education system in a country like India can survive without the endorsement of industry, which further translates into job opportunities and better living standards. It is encouraging to see how the Indian Industry has recognised this paradigm philosophical shift in learning. Not only has industry started to partner with Online Learning Platforms to create and deliver content but has also started to collaborate and partner with platforms to absorb the learners on these platforms for fulfilling their requirement for upskilled professionals for the high growth career paths. Technology is bringing in a philosophical shift, true but it is not the silver bullet. Its role in the field of education can't be ignored and will yield long-term returns only when it is coupled with the needs of the customer, strengthened with valuable customer relationships and meaningful customer engagement.

How to deal with bullying

Preparedness, prevention and early intervention are factors that can help youth, says DR ZIRAK MARKER

Nothing is strong as gentleness, and nothing is as gentle as real strength — RALPH SOCKMAN

Mental health concerns in our youth are on the rise. No matter what the age or grade of a child, all our children are vulnerable and as parents, we need to be cognizant of our child's emotional and psychological needs at all times. With a high increase in stress levels, substance abuse, adolescent suicides, exposure to social media and other factors that jeopardise their well being — preparedness, prevention and early intervention — are the key factors to equip us to save a life or just simply preserve our youth.

Fitting in and not standing out is an integral part of our Youth today in discovering who they are and amalgamating their identity. Around 30-70 percent of school-going children experience bullying or peer pressure in some form or the other. However, only less than half of them report it. Whether it's emotional, verbal, physical, sexual or cyberbullying - it usually slips the parental radar because of the guilt, fear and shame that ride high in the victims. Most children and adolescents never share as they feel embarrassed or threatened that it will get worse if reported. They go through extreme feelings of rejection and isolation. Low self-confidence, anxiety and depression; lack of loss of interest and motivation; inability to focus or concentrate; disturbed appetite and sleep patterns and psychosomatic symptoms. Bullies too, are perhaps victims themselves. They may come from dysfunctional homes/environments or just have behavioural patterns based on their narcissistic personality traits.

Let us see, where are probable possibilities in stages of decision-making where we tend to eliminate wrong which could be a brighter right. There are four stages when it comes to decision-making. These are: Determining Possibilities: The first step is figuring out which factors to take into account when considering an issue. Often one tends to discard as many as possible or

not even consider some of them in the first place when considering an issue, considering it will help to narrow down to most possible solution as well reduce time involved, very importantly assuming it will make things easy. Remember complexity should be kept at bay. Analysing causality: After defining possibilities, one applies a filter of relationship with those possibilities, based on assumptions, past references and experience. One might not be aware of the

terminology called linear regression but we use it often while analysing possibilities. Envisioning the decision: Every decision is a result of combination of events, actions, decisions. One often breaks down a problem into independent pieces and work on them separately or in a certain order. Achieving resolution: All the above three, leads to an alternative which one accepts assuming it as the best possible alternative, even if one might not be cent percent satisfied. It is accepting between

either and or. The complete decision-making process can be seen in a different light: Determining Possibilities: Considering all possibilities and multiple opportunities even if it involves complexity and time. Analysing causality: Looking at the glass not only as half filled or half empty, but thinking out of the box - encouraging innovation, new ideas, challenging status quo. Envisioning the decision: Seeing the entire jigsaw puzzle — how the various parts

of it fit together, how one decision will affect another. Achieving resolution: Thinking beyond of either and or. Starting back the entire thought process again even if it takes more time, delay in decision making and adding efforts. There are opportunities to explore at every juncture — why miss it by seeing things through the same lens. Explore the world of possibilities — use the integrative thinking. YESTERDAY ONCE MORE: DHONI LEADS INDIA FOR 200TH TIME

Mahendra Singh Dhoni on Tuesday had a date with destiny as he got to lead India for the 200th time in ODIs, nearly two years after giving up captaincy on his own terms.

With skipper Rohit Sharma and his deputy Shikhar Dhawan being rested after four matches in six days, it was nothing but sheer destiny that India's most successful captain walked out alongside match referee Andy Pycroft and Afghanistan skipper Asghar Afghan for the toss in their Asia Cup game.

Dhoni has never bothered about milestones and that is why he remained unfazed while calling time on his Test career with 10 short of 100 matches, a benchmark for any cricketer worth his salt.

It didn't matter to Dhoni one bit even though he had no competition.

No wonder when the decision to quit ODI captaincy was announced in early January 2017, his fans were less surprised. It didn't matter that he had a chance to captain India in 200 ODIs.

But then if destiny had made an elaborate plan, it was not in Dhoni's hands to change the script.

"I was not really sure of where I am standing. I have captained in 199 ODIs, so this gives me an opportunity to make it 200. It's all destiny and I always believed in that," Dhoni said with a poker face when Russell Arnold posed the question at the toss.

Since numbers didn't matter during his halcyon days, it was all the more expected that it would matter even less when he is in the twilight of his illustrious career.

"It's not in my control, once I left captainship," he said when asked if he ever thought that he would be able to complete 200 ODIs as captain.

Then came the usual Dhoni answer. "Good to complete 200, but I don't think it really matters," he sounded business as usual.

But people who were used to see him lead for 10 years were happy.

"He is hundred percent the most popular Indian captain," Sunil Gavaskar made the most telling statement.

ace cricketer Virat Kohli sent the shuttlers into a clicking frenzy as he received the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna award, sharing the country's highest sporting honour with diminutive world champion weightlifter Mirabai Chanu at the Rashtrapati Bhawan here on Tuesday.

Star javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra, who won Gold medals in the Commonwealth and Asian Games this year, and junior world champion sprinter Hima Das were among the 20 sports persons, who received the Arjuna Award from President Ram Nath Kovind here.

The ceremony, which is traditionally held on August 29 to commemorate the birth anniversary of hockey legend Major Dhyan Chand, was pushed to September 25 this year to avoid a clash of dates with the 18th Asian Games in Jakarta and

Palembang, which concluded on September 2.

Kohli was accompanied by his actor wife Anushka Sharma, his mother Saroj Kohli and his elder brother Vikas at the ceremony.

Kohli is the third cricketer to be honoured with the Khel Ratna after batting legend Sachin Tendulkar (1997-1998) and former captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni (2007).

The world's No 1 Test batsman as per the ICC rankings, has been in stupendous form in the past three years though he missed out of the top award despite nominations in 2016 and 2017.

Kohli received the Arjuna award in 2013 and the Padma Shri last year.

Sharing the top honours with him was Chanu, who had received the Padma Shri earlier this year, was chosen for the Khel Ratna following her Gold medal in 48kg category at the World Weightlifting

Championships last year.

She also bagged the yellow metal in this year's Commonwealth Games but didn't compete at the Asian Games due to injury.

"It was a huge honour for me. I never expected I will receive the award so early in my career. It is one of the happiest moment

of my life," Chanu said.

Chanu, who missed the Asian Games due to a back injury, said she has started training again but will return to the international arena only in April next year.

"It's been a week that I have started training again. The doctors have advised me to go slow so I will miss the World Championships in November. I am expecting to return at the Asian Championships in next April," she said.

While the Khel Ratna award carries a prize purse of ₹ 7.5 lakh, the Arjuna awardees are given ₹ 5 lakh each along with a citation.

Besides the Khel Ratna and Arjuna awards, the President also gave away Dronacharya and Dhyan Chand awards to coaches, the Tenzing Norgay National Adventure awards, Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Trophy and Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puraskar.

The awards, like every year, copped a fair share of controversies after wrestler Bajrang Punia's threat to move court over Khel Ratna snub being the most prominent one. He eventually backed down after meeting Sports Minister Rajyavardhan Rathore.

The Dronacharya Award was presented to eight coaches this year, including cricket mentor Tarak Sinha and 39-year-old boxing coach C A Kuttappa, who was credited by Vijender Singh for his historic Olympic Bronze in 2008.

The Dhyan Chand Award for lifetime sporting achievement was given to four former athletes.

Among the notable absentees was cricketer Smriti Mandhana and tennis player Rohan Bopanna, both of whom were to receive the Arjuna award. Mandhana is currently with the Indian women's team on its tour of Sri Lanka while Bopanna is playing an ATP event in Chengdu, China.

Modric The Best

Croatian midfielder beats Cristiano and Salah to break Messi, Ronaldo's decade-long grip to win FIFA's best player year award



Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi were far from the auditorium by the River Thames when Luka Modric broke their decade-long grip on FIFA's award for the world's best player.

Football's biggest individual accolade was handed to the 33-year-old playmaker on Monday night in recognition of a year when he led Croatia to its first World Cup final and won a fourth Champions League title in five seasons with Real Madrid.

"It is very important, because for such a small country to win the best player award, it's something amazing and that shows other small countries that everything is possible," Modric said. "You just need to believe and to work for it. And that all dreams could come true."

It required voters to be more imaginative and not just make the predictable picks of Ronaldo and Messi, who split the previous 10 awards. Messi voted for Modric, while Ronaldo and Modric each voted for Real Madrid's Raphael Varane.




France's Didier Deschamps receives the Best FIFA Men's Coach award from Arsene Wenger

Brazil's Marta did become a six-time winner, earning the women's honor for the first time since 2010.

Another Brazilian, Kaka, had been the last player other than Messi or Ronaldo to claim the men's prize from FIFA, at the 2007 gala.

"We knew we were surrounded by two aliens that were just sharing these awards," Real Madrid and Spain defender Sergio Ramos said. "But I think it is also very positive to recognize the work, the career and the season of players that are not just strikers. I am really happy for Luka Modric."

Modric has had to accept playing in Ronaldo's shadow during six years at Madrid even as the 1.72 meters (5-foot-8)

technically-gifted Croatian's ingenuity on the ball and passing range made him as a key component in the team's European dominance.

Modric and Ronaldo on a third successive Champions League in May before achieving something far more unexpected: captaining Croatia to its first World Cup final.

"I would change all my individual trophies for that trophy of World Cup champion," Modric said, reflecting on the 4-2 loss to France in the final in July.

Modric, who joined Madrid from Tottenham in 2012, received 29 percent of votes from the coaches and captains of national teams, reporters and fans.

Ronaldo, who left Madrid in the off-

season to join Italian champion Juventus, was second with 19 percent. He captained European Portugal to a round-of-16 exit at the World Cup.

Mohamed Salah was third with 11 percent after scoring a record 32 goals in a 38-game English Premier League season for Liverpool, which reached its first Champions League final in 11 years.

France forward Kylian Mbappe was fourth and Messi fifth with just under 10 percent of the vote. Messi scored 45 goals for Barcelona, which won the Spanish title, but only netted once at the World Cup as Argentina was eliminated in the round of 16.

Messi and Ronaldo skipped the ceremony at London's Royal Festival Hall and sent no messages of congratulations to Modric on their social media accounts, which have hundreds of millions of followers.

"Two guys we don't know," actor Idris Elba, who hosted the show, said after highlighting the absence of Messi and Ronaldo. Former Croatia captain Zvonimir Boban, now a FIFA deputy secretary general, cried after being lauded by Modric from the stage.

"At this particular moment, I would like to mention my footballing idol and captain of Croatia generation 1998," Modric said, referring to the team that finished third in the nation's first World Cup appearance 20 years ago. "He was my big inspiration and that team gave us belief that we could achieve something great in Russia. Hopefully we can be the same for next generations."

WOMEN'S AWARD

Marta won after leading Brazil to Copa America Femenina glory. The 32-year-old also scored 13 goals as Orlando Pride reached the NWSL playoffs.

"It was worth all the sacrifices," the striker said.

COACHES

No French player was among the finalists but Didier Deschamps was voted manager of the year after becoming only the third man to win the World Cup as a player and coach.

Reynald Pedros, the Frenchman who led Lyon to French league and Champions League glory, became the first club coach to win the women's game award, previously exclusive to national-team managers.

GOAL

Salah didn't leave empty-handed, earning the Puskas Award for his goal in the Merseyside derby last December. Salah's goal in Liverpool's 1-1 draw against Everton was a mixture of strength and footwork. Receiving a pass from right back Joe Gomez, Salah shrugged off Cuca Martina, twisted inside Idrissa Gueye and curled a left-footed shot around Ashley Williams and into the top corner.

GOALKEEPER

Thibaut Courtois added the FIFA goalkeeper award to the Golden Glove he collected in Russia for helping Belgium to third place with three clean sheets. Courtois left Chelsea for Madrid after the tournament.

Ronaldo turns to Juve challenge after FIFA snub

Cristiano Ronaldo turns his focus back to Juventus's quest for a treble this season on Wednesday after losing out in the FIFA's best player of the year award.

He had been nominated for his superb overhead bicycle kick for Real Madrid against Juventus in last season's Champions League quarter-final, which even drew a standing ovation from Juventus supporters in Turin.

Juventus coach Massimiliano Allegri had backed Ronaldo — who has scored three goals in his last two league games — for the award, as he led the way in the Champions League with 15 goals to help Real to a third straight title.

"With no offence to Luka Modric, I'd give the Ballon d'Or to Ronaldo for what he did last season. I think he deserves it," said Allegri.

The Italian champions face a heavy week in Turin with three games in their Allianz Stadium in the space of seven days.

After Wednesday's game against 18th-placed Bologna, who shocked Roma 2-0 at the weekend, Juventus play Carlo Ancelotti's Napoli in a top-of-the-table clash on Saturday.

Juventus have had a perfect start to the season with five wins and 15 points — three points ahead of Napoli.

Allegri's side also play Swiss club Young Boys in the Champions League a week on Tuesday, a game which Ronaldo will miss after his controversial sending off against Valencia in Spain.

ROMA CRISIS

Napoli host promoted Parma, before their trip to Turin, with an eye on their Champions League game against Liverpool in Naples.

"We won there (Juventus) last season and still finished second," said Napoli striker Lorenzo Insigne.

"If we don't win the midweek game with Parma, then the result with Juve is irrelevant, so we have to take it one at a time."

Under-pressure Roma host promoted Frosinone looking for a boost after slipping to 14th with their weekend defeat in Bologna.

Coach Eusebio Di Francesco has reportedly been given a week to save his job, starting against the newcomers from outside Rome, before the city derby against Lazio at the weekend.

Frosinone are second from the bottom of the table with 12 goals conceded, including two to Juventus last weekend.

Roma then host Czech club Viktoria Plzen in the Champions League next week, having lost their opener to holders Real Madrid.

won, we are happy with a point and aim on our next opponents," Bibiano said, reflecting on India's three missed chances in the last five minutes.

"We had aimed for a win, but I am very pleased and happy with a point and a draw. As long as chances are created, goals would come. It would have been a worry if chances were not created," the coach added.

Defender Bikash Yumnam said

"it won't be easy against Indonesia".

"We were very compact defensively against Iran. We know we had to play together as a unit. Iran are very strong in attack but we devised a plan to counter that," he said.

"It won't be easy against Indonesia. They have very swift forwards. We will stick to our strategy against them. We will give our best."

Indian Open to begin from Oct 18

India's premier women's golf event — the Hero Indian Open — will be contested over 72 holes for the first time when it tees off at the DLF Golf and Country Club here from October 18-21, the organisers announced on Tuesday.

The event will see as many as 120 players from over 30 countries vying for the coveted trophy.

The tournament will witness the defending champion Camille Chevalier of France trying to extend her hold over the trophy from a strong field of international and Indian players.

The tournament, co-sponsored by Castrol, will set a host of new landmarks — starting with the prize money that touches a record \$ half a million for the first time, making it the second richest golf tournament in the country after the men's Indian Open.

The prize money gets a 25 per cent increase over 2017 and a five-fold increase from its inaugural edition in 2007.

The international players include Camille, former champion Swedish Caroline Hedwall, Beth Allen - the 2016 LET Order of Merit winner, Thailand's Kanyalak Preedasuttit - winner of the Thailand Ladies Open, and Celine Boutier - winner of the Australian Ladies Classic.

Currently, 11 of the top-20 players on the LET OOM have entered the tournament, which is already higher than previous years. There are nine tournament winners in the field, which includes the 2016 winner of the LET OOM.

Sasikiran with black faced initial difficulties despite a huge rating difference and sacrificed a pawn to reach what looked like a promising endgame optically.


With some precise defense from his opponent, the Indian decided to take the draw as the team had won anyway.

Wozniacki, Kerber sizzle at Wuhan

World number two Caroline Wozniacki and Wimbledon champion Angelique Kerber eased through their opening matches at the Wuhan Open in China on Tuesday.

Australian Open champion Wozniacki, who received a first-round bye, was barely troubled by the 61st-ranked Swede Rebecca Peterson, winning 6-4, 6-1 to set up a third-round clash with Olympic champion Monica Puig, who romped past Aliaksandra Sasnovich 6-2, 6-2.

Peterson offered some resistance in the first set, breaking Wozniacki's serve at 5-2, but faded as the Dane — who lost her first match at Japan's Pan Pacific Open last week — quickly regained control as she looks for a good run in Wuhan to secure a

return to the WTA Finals, which she won last year.

"It's great to get a good start, obviously. Every match counts," Wozniacki said.

World number three Kerber has already qualified for next month's Finals which will be held in Singapore and advanced after a knee injury forced her American opponent Madison Keys to retire.

The German looked set for a big win over the 2017 US Open semi-finalist and was leading 6-0, 4-1 when Keys could not continue.

"I was feeling good. I played the first set really well," Kerber said. "It's nice to be in the next round."

Kerber, who could return to world number one ranking with a successful end to the season, earlier said that she was not concerned about rankings.

"For me it's the most important thing, that I go on court, play my best, have fun out there, enjoying every single moment. We will see what's happening at the end of the year," she said on Monday.
