India to stop its water into Pak

Implementation may take six years as 100-m high dams need to be built

India has decided to stop the flow of its share of water to Pakistan from rivers under the Indus Water Treaty, a move seen as an immediate fallout of deadly terrorist attack that killed 40 paramilitary personnel in south Kashmir.

Water Resources Minister Nitin Gadkari tweeted to convey the decision of the Government to stop India's share of water going to Pakistan.

But the actual implementation of the decision may take up to six years as dams as high as 100 metres will have to be built to stop such flow, officials said insisting its decision was in no way a violation of the Treaty and was only aimed at getting the rightful due to people of the country.

Under the Indus Water Treaty signed in 1960, the waters of the western rivers — the Indus, the Jhelum, and the

Chenab — was given to Pakistan and those of the eastern rivers — the Ravi, the Beas, and the Sutlej — to India.

India's share of water from the Ravi, the Beas and the Sutlej came to 33 million acres feet (MAF). While about 95 per cent of the water was being used in the country after the

construction of three main dams across the rivers, close to 5 per cent water or 1.6 MAF would flow to Pakistan.

To gain access to this water, India is now building more dams which will be completed in six years, officials said.

Another official said the decision was taken two months

back. Water to Pakistan from the three rivers has been flowing for 60 years while the country needs the same to meet needs of its citizens, they said insisting stopping of its share of water from going to Pakistan is in no way a violation of the Treaty.

"Under the leadership of

Hon'ble PM Sri @narendramodi ji, Our Govt. Has decided to stop our share of water which used to flow to Pakistan. We will divert water from Eastern rivers and supply it to our people in Jammu & Kashmir and Punjab," Gadkari said in a tweet.

He further said, "The construction of dam has started at Shahpur-Kandi on the Ravi. Moreover, UJH project will store our share of water for use in J&K and the balance water will flow from 2nd Ravi-BEAS Link to provide water to other basin States."

Gadkari's tweets have come barely a week after the gruesome Pulwama terror attack on February 14 in which as many as 40 CRPF personnel were martyred when a terrorist rammed an explosives laden vehicle into a bus carrying them.

New Delhi believes the attack was planned and supported by elements in Pakistan.

SP bags 37, sacrifices 1 for RLD, gives BSP 38

Over a month after announcing an alliance for the upcoming Lok Sabha polls, the Samajwadi Party (SP) and the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) announced the allocation of seats to each partner on Thursday.

In a statement, SP president Akhilesh Yadav and BSP chief Mayawati announced that

in west UP, 16 in east UP, nine in central UP and two each in Terai and Bundelkhand region.

Akhilesh is likely to contest from Kannauj and Mulayam Singh Yadav from Mainpuri. The SP has been given all the five seats it had won in the 2014 parliamentary elections — Azamgarh, Kannauj, Mainpuri, Budaun and Ferozabad. In the Lok

Sabha by-elections, the SP had wrested the prized Gorakhpur and Kairana seats from the BJP. Because of its sway in eastern UP, the BSP will contest 17 seats of the region, including Ambedkar Nagar where Mayawati is expected to contest. The BSP will contest 11 seats of western UP, eight in central UP and two in Bundelkhand region.

No wind power at ecology cost: Govt

To ensure that its ambition to install 30,000 megawatt of offshore wind power by 2030 does not come at the cost of the marine ecology health, the Government has proposed that lease of any wind farm in the sector will be cancelled if they are found posing threat to flora and fauna beneath the sea water.

This is one of the major reasons for lease cancellations proposed in the draft Offshore Wind Energy Lease Rules, 2019 issued by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE). The Ministry is now seeking suggestions and opinion from the public about the proposed rules. The rules also propose penalty to the defaulter project proponent in the form of fine and jail imprisonment, if found violating the norms.

As per the draft rules, lease of an offshore wind power project can be cancelled if it is found to be "causing environmental damage to both flora and fauna beneath the sea water and posing threat to human life and property while carrying out the activities under water and operation of the wind energy turbines during validity of the lease."

The draft rules also maintain that "If, in the opinion of the Central Government, operation of the wind turbines/wind turbines is causing damage to environment or damage to property, or pollution can thereby be prevented, the Central Government may order the Wind Farm to be shut down pending an enquiry under sub-rule (a), which enquiry shall be held within a reasonable period of the making of such order."

In offshore wind farms, wind turbines are elevated over the sea level with different types of foundations, depending on the depth. The large-scale deployment of offshore wind farms is the part of the Government's shift to renewable energy.

while the SP will contest on 37 seats, the BSP will fight on 38. Amethi and Rae Bareilly — the pocket boroughs of the Rahul family — have been left for the Congress.

The three other seats left for other parties by the BSP-SP alliance are Baghpat, Muzaffarnagar and Mathura for the RLD.

On January 12, when the SP and BSP announced their alliance, both Mayawati and Akhilesh had said they would contest 38 seats each and leave four seats for other parties including two for Congress. But the SP sacrificed one seat from its quota to pacify the RLD.

Opp walks out over EWS quota from Assembly

Demanding implementation of the 10 per cent quota for the poor in the general category introduced by a recent Constitutional amendment, the opposition BJP members on Thursday staged a walk-out in the State Assembly.

Soon after Question Hour ended, Leader of Opposition Gopal Bhargava demanded that the quota for the economically weaker sections (EWS) in the general category be implemented in government jobs and educational institutes.

Ten states have already implemented this quota, the BJP leader claimed. The Congress government in Madhya Pradesh was trying to deny this benefit to the unemployed youth by resorting to the ruse of forming a committee on the issue, Bhargava alleged. Other BJP MLAs supported him. Speaker NP Prajapati, in the meanwhile, expressed displeasure over Congress MLAs and ministers roaming in the House and flocking around treasury benches and talking to each other. When his appeal to them to return to their seats went unheeded, he adjourned

the House for five minutes.

When proceedings resumed, Bhargava again raised the issue of EWS quota. Narottam Mishra, another BJP MLA, said the government was playing with the future of the youth in the general category.

What was the need to form a cabinet sub-committee on the issue instead of implementing the quota immediately, Mishra asked.

Minister for Parliamentary Affairs Govind Singh said reservations for the general category was one of the promises in the Congress' manifesto too, and the government was ready to implement it. But the committee was formed to decide on issues such as eligibility criteria, process, and for finding out how many people fall under the EWS category, he said.

Singh's reply did not satisfy BJP MLAs while Narottam Mishra reached the well of the House.

Bhargava alleged that by forming the committee, the state government only deferred the issue and it did not want to give the poor in the general category their constitutional right. Opposition members then staged a walk-out.

7 farmers killed selves since regime change in MP

Bhopal: Seven farmer suicides were reported in Madhya Pradesh since the regime change last December, the Assembly was informed Thursday.

In a written reply to a question, Minister for Farmers Welfare Sachin Yadav said seven farmers have ended life in the state since December 11, when the assembly election results were announced. In his reply, the minister also stated that indebtedness was not the reason for any of the seven suicides. The Congress ended the BJP's 15-year-rule in the November 2018 elections. The new government announced a loan waiver for farmers on the very first day in the office.

BJP MLA Vishwas Sarang had asked a question about two farmer suicides in Khandwa and Shajapur districts. Jawan Singh (42), resident of Astaria village in Khandwa who committed suicide, was a habitual drinker and had had a dispute with the wife over money, the reply said.

Premanarayan (65), resident of Sukliya in Shajapur district, committed suicide allegedly because another man in the village was harassing his wife, it said.

Premanarayan also owed Rs 1.75 lakh to financial institutions, but no debt recovery notice had been served to him, it added.

Fire breaks out at Gammon India Mall

Electronic goods and furniture of Deepmala Infrastructure office worth lakhs of rupees were gutted in massive fire that broke in the wee hours on Thursday at Gammon India Mall in TT Nagar.

The fire which broke out at 6 am was pacified within one and a half hours by around a dozen fire tender vehicles. Fire tenders were pressed into service after receiving information of fire at the office.

The fire was controlled before it could damage the nearby shops and offices of the mall. Police and fire brigade were informed by Site Administrative Officer Prashant Sharma after he came to know about the fire.

The security guard at the site informed Sharma about the

fire. Sharma told the police that he left the office after closing at

around 7.15 pm on Wednesday and at around 6 am he got information of fire. The loss is estimated to be around Rs 15 lakh.

In the fire four computers, four air conditioners, two printers, two photocopier machines, CCTV systems and furniture were gutted in fire completely. Company which is working as construction agency to develop the mall has claimed that important documents and records were also damaged in the fire.

The reason of the fire remains unknown as in the initial investigation it was found that the fire was not short circuit borne. Investigation would be conducted regarding the reason of the fire. Police suspects that the office was set on fire which was alleged by the employees of the company.

Even after good spell of rainfall rise in the day temperature was witnessed on Thursday in the state capital and it was recorded 6.6 degree Celsius above normal temperature at 35.8 degree Celsius.

The night temperature was recorded at 19.8 degree Celsius which was 6.3 degree Celsius above the normal temperature. Day temperatures were recorded around 35 degree Celsius in the state while Khargone recorded day temperature at 40 degree Celsius.

Rainfall was witnessed at several places in the state.

Bhopal and Hoshangabad divisions witnessed rainfall and hailstorm at few places.

Night temperatures increased significantly in Bhopal division while Shahdol, Hoshangabad, Indore and Ujjain divisions recorded increase in the night temperatures. The lowest temperature was recorded at 9 degree Celsius at Mandla. The rainfall and thundery activities are likely to be witnessed in Sagar, Rewa, Shahdol, Jabalpur, Gwalior, Chambal and Bhopal divisions and Hoshangabad, Betul, Harda and Burhanpur districts. Massive crop damaged occurred after rainfall and hailstorm activities few days ago still state is rain deficit as the East and West Madhya Pradesh are rain deficient by 37 percent, and 62 percent, respectively.

DEATH OF 6 FARMERS IN SHOOTING Digvijay: Case will be re-investigated

Senior Congress leader Digvijay Singh has said the police firing incident at Mandasaur, in which six farmers were killed during the previous BJP Government in Madhya Pradesh, will be re-investigated and no clean chit has been given to anyone in the case.

A controversy had erupted when Home Minister Bala Bachchan had told the assembly last week that the 2017 police action was in self-defence and to protect government and private properties,

virtually endorsing the stand taken by the Shivraj Singh Chouhan administration.

The written statement had left the state Congress, which had made the Mandasaur police firing a key election issue, red-faced.

The Congress came to power in Madhya Pradesh last year after a gap of 15 years.

While talking to media persons at Shajapur, Singh said, "The police firing in Mandasaur district that left six farmers dead in June 2017 (during an agitation) will be re-investigated. No clean chit has been given to anyone in it."

"BJP men and officers (considered close to the party) were still sitting pretty in lower rung in the (Congress) government. These people were behind such a reply on the floor of the assembly," the Rajya Sabha member claimed.

Bachchan's reply Monday had riled the former chief minister, who had publicly expressed his displeasure.

Nath was replying to the discussions on issues that cannot be delayed related to public importance held on the damage caused to the crops by the cold weather at Vidhan Sabha today under the Rule - 139.

Nath said that the opposition should not worry at all for loan waiver. We had made promise in the manifesto in this regard and are making preparations for it since the last 6 months. A planned policy has been made for the loan waiver. We have said that loan upto ₹2 lakh will be waived off.

Whether the loan has been taken from the scheduled bank, cooperative bank or RRB, it will be waived off. He further mentioned that the opposition need not worry; its problem will be solved after 15 days, when 25 lakh farmers of the state will inform that their loan has been waived off. The Chief Minister further said that he will begin the process of the loan waiver

from tomorrow from Ratlam. He mentioned that the loan waiver is neither artificial nor gimmick, this is a real loan waiver.

In regard to the affected crops by hail and cold weather, Kamal Nath said this is not new. When we were in the opposition, this kind of natural calamities used to occur. We know about the lapses, which occurred during the survey of hail and cold weather affected crops in the past. The Chief Minister further stated that compensation will be given to each farmer of the state on the basis of survey by eradicating the lapses.

Besides, the Chief Minister said that wheat procurement centers will not be reduced. Not a single centre from the procurement centers which were made in the past will be reduced. He mentioned that the procurement centers cannot be increased due to the shortage of time but they will not be reduced.

Kendu leaf workers stage demo at RDC office

Send memo to CM, warn of 'Rasta Roko' on March 1

Hundreds of Kendu leaf workers, including women, on Thursday staged a demonstration in front of the Revenue Divisional Commissioner's office here, demanding reduction of GST from the kendu leaf and reintroduction of scholarship for the workers' children.

Kendu leaf workers from 10 districts of western Odisha participated in the demonstration and warned that both the Union and the State governments

would face serious consequences in the next general elections if they fail to fulfill their longstanding demands.

The meeting presided over by Odisha Kendu Leaf Workers' Union president and BJD leader Bijoy Mohanaty strongly criticized the State Government for not fulfilling their demands despite repeated agitations. They submitted a 11-point charter of demands, addressed to Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, to the Additional Secretary of the RDC Bikash Chandra Ben.

"Implementation of GST is increasing the prices of the kendu leaf and making the whole issue complicated. We have been demanding reduction of GST for the interest of the

backward and tribal workers involved in the trade but nobody is listening to our demands," Mohanaty said.

Stating that the State has been getting annual profit of more than Rs 200 crore, Mohanaty said the State Government has directed to stop giving stipend to the children of the kendu leaf workers. More than 40,000 children will be affected by this decision, he lamented.

He warned that kendu leaf workers would stage a 'Rasta Roko' for four hours in different parts of the State on March 1 if demands are not met by then.

Leaders of the various trade unions were present.

Step to provide better communication facilities taken

State government has created a new policy to provide better communication facilities to the people of the state.

For this the policy was approved at the Cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Kamal Nath in Jabalpur on February 16.

This policy will be applicable till 2023 or till the announcement of the new policy.

The committee formed by the state government for IT will be authorized to make amendments or enhance this policy.

"Basic Infrastructure Establishment Policy to provide Infrastructure Provider Madhya Pradesh 2019 for providing wireline or wireless based voice or data access services" will establish strong, secure, high quality and uninterrupted telecommunication in the entire state keeping in mind the needs of communication for the development of the society and economy. District collectors will work as the licensing authority through single window for the implementation of this policy in the districts.

They will be authorized to grant licenses on the underground, over-ground work or private property of state government or any other agency.

The objective of the new policy will be to ensure the planned development and expansion of the basic infrastructure of communication facilities in the state.

The use of tele-density and internet will be increased in all parts of the state.

Affordable, reliable, high-speed and demand-based voice and data access services will be made available to the citizens and organizations.

A simple and transparent framework will be set up to provide permission and approval of institutions that want to establish telecommunication infrastructure with the new policy.

The provisions of the new policy will be applicable in place of the policy of 4G Broadband wireline and wireless access services of 2013 effective earlier in Madhya Pradesh.

The companies that work to provide wireline and wireless based data or voice access services should mandatorily have the license to work as an Infrastructure Provider Company issued by the Department of Telecom, Government of India.

As per the Infrastructure provisions in the policy, the licensed companies should have pre-built structure, shelter, cable, duct and required equipment for the construction of any structure and the experience of establishing a setup to provide wireline, wire-based voice and data access services. The company must have service providers (TSP), Infrastructure Provider, (IP) Internet Service Provider (ISP) and accessories like Generator Solar Panel.

After Pulwama attack PM was busy shooting for film: Cong

The Congress on Thursday sharpened its attack on Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the Pulwama terrorist attack last week. While it continued to target Modi for his "opened arm" engagement with the crown Prince of Saudi Arabia during the latter visit to India, the grand old party took on the PM over his publicity campaign shooting for a film in the Corbett National Park till the evening of February 14 despite the Pulwama attack taking place in the afternoon.

There was no immediate reaction from the Prime Minister's Office and the BJP over the allegations. Congress' chief spokesperson Randeep Singh Surjewala, addressing a Press conference, also accused BJP president Amit Shah of "politicisation of terrorism" in his speech in Assam on Sunday.

The Congress said questions must be asked about the "gross intelligence failure" of this Government and on the "priorities of a Prime Minister who on a sensitive time like this has gone on a foreign tour to South Korea instead of tackling terrorism".


Citing reports from newspapers, Surjewala gave a timeline of events saying the terror attack happened at 3:10 pm on February 14 with the Congress reacting to it at 5:15 pm. "The Prime Minister also knew about it. Yet the PM, a person who claims himself to be a nationalist, continues to shoot a film (for Discovery Channel) for self propagation in the Corbett National Park in Ramnagar," he claimed.

The Congress spokesperson alleged that the Prime Minister continued to "enjoy boat rides" with the camera crew and later ensured that there was slogan shouting by the BJP people in his favour.

"The Prime Minister continues to have tea, samosas at seven o'clock at Government expense in a PWD guesthouse when every single Indian household didn't have food," he said.

On one hand the country was picking up the "pieces of our martyrs", and on the other hand the Prime Minister was involved in his "propaganda and publicity", Surjewala claimed.

"Can such a conduct be expected from the Prime Minister of a country. The Prime Minister should have been chairing the Cabinet committee on security immediately and should have taken

action, instead of shooting films," he said.

Surjewala said the Congress had shown restraint on the direction of party president Rahul Gandhi, but it was important to raise issues of such conduct that "insults martyrs". "The Congress party and the entire nation stands united with our armed forces as also our Government in every step that they take in tackling Pakistan-sponsored terrorism. We are determined in that resolve even today," he said.

Surjewala also hit out at the conduct of BJP leaders in the aftermath of the attack. He displayed a photograph purportedly showing BJP MP Sakshi Maharaj smiling during the final journey of a slain jawan and cited Union Tourism Minister KJ Alphonso taking a "selfie" at a soldier's funeral.

Alphonso has denied taking the picture himself saying some miscreants circulated his photograph at the CRPF jawan's funeral as a "selfie".

Surjewala also said Pakistan will not succeed in its designs and invoked Indira Gandhi's strong action in 1971. He also asserted that the Congress, when in power, has always taken moral responsibility in such situations.

Congress spokesperson slammed the Prime Minister for receiving Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman at the airport and asked whether according a grand welcome to "those who praised" Pakistan's "anti-terror efforts" was his way of remembering the Pulwama attack victims.

Taking on the Congress for attacking Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the Pulwama attack, the BJP on Thursday lashed out at the Opposition party saying its stand exposes the claim that it was standing with the Government and armed forces in the aftermath of the terror attack in Kashmir and that the party sounds like echoing voices from across the border.

Addressing a Press conference, Union Minister and BJP leader Ravi Shankar Prasad accused the Congress of seeking to weaken the morale of the armed forces at a time when the whole world is "firmly standing" with India.

Prasad hit out at the Congress for its "shameful" attack on Prime Minister Narendra Modi and said he was in Uttarakhand on the day of Pulwama attack as part of an official programme related to tiger conservation. "Was the Congress aware of the Pulwama attack? We were not aware," the BJP leader said in a dig at the Opposition party.

He said the Congress attack on the Modi Government would have pleased Pakistan adding that styles of what Imran Khan and the Opposition party have said may be different but their contents bore striking resemblance. He charged the Congress with demoralising armed forces in the country where valiantly responding to terror outfits.

Prasad said strength of the Modi Government reflected in removing security of the Kashmir separatists and eagerness of Kashmiri youth to participate in Army recruitment. He said India has received global backing against Pakistan on the Pulwama attack and the neighbouring country was diplomatically isolated.



Prez promulgates four ordinances

After nod, ordinance makes practice of instant triple talaq penal offence

President Ram Nath Kovind on Thursday promulgated four ordinances, including the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Second Ordinance, 2019. After the President's nod, the ordinance will come into force for the third time in less than a year. The ordinance makes the practice of instant Triple Talaq a penal offence.

The Union Cabinet had given its approval to re-issue the ordinance on Tuesday. The Government failed to pass the Bill, known as the Triple Talaq Bill, in the Rajya Sabha during the Budget Session of Parliament.

The Centre had first promulgated the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Ordinance in September 2018. A Bill to replace it was passed in the Lok Sabha in December, but remained pending in the Rajya Sabha.

The Government promulgated the ordinance again after the Winter Session of Parliament, but could not pass the Bill in the Rajya Sabha during the Budget Session.

The ordinance is set to lapse on June 3, when the current Government's term ends and before the next session of Parliament.

The Triple Talaq ordinance has faced stiff resistance from the Opposition parties. On February 20, SP chief Akhilesh Yadav had said that the ordinance will be used as "a weapon against minorities."

The other ordinances which promulgated by the President, are the Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Second Ordinance 2019; the Companies (Amendment) Second Ordinance 2019 and the Banning of Unregulated Deposit Schemes Second Ordinance 2019.

The Banning of Unregulated Deposit Schemes Second Ordinance 2019 is to protect gullible investors from

Ponzi schemes. The Ordinance will immediately tackle the menace of illicit deposit-taking activities in the country launched by rapacious operators, which at present are exploiting regulatory gaps and lack of strict administrative measures to dupe poor and gullible people of their hard-earned savings.

The Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Second Ordinance, 2019 to allow the Board of Governors (BOG) to run the scam-tainted apex body for regulating medical education.

The Companies (Amendment) Second Ordinance 2019 is based on the recommendations of the Committee to review offences under the Companies Act, 2013, so as to fill critical gaps in the corporate governance & compliance framework as enshrined in the Companies Act 2013, while simultaneously extending greater Ease of Doing Business to law abiding corporates.

The President also gave his assent to changes in the Indian Stamp Act, 1899, which will rationalise and harmonise the system of levying stamp duty and help curb tax evasion. The Amendments to the Indian Stamp Act, 1899, were introduced as part of the Finance Act 2019, and was approved by Parliament.

The amendments propose to create the legal and institutional mechanism to enable States to collect stamp duty on securities market instruments at one place by one agency (through the Stock Exchanges or Clearing Corporations authorised by the stock exchange or by the Depositories), the Finance Ministry said in a statement. A mechanism for appropriately sharing the stamp duty with relevant State Governments based on state of domicile of the buying client is also proposed, it added.

The proposed rationalised and harmonised system is expected to lead to zero tax evasion. The stamp duty will have to be paid by either the buyer or seller of a financial security, as against the current practice of levying the duty on both, the Ministry added.

JeM fidayeen bomber used YSMS app, says probe

Preliminary probe into the Pulwama has revealed that YSMS, a mobile application, was hosted on the 'dark web' and regulation of such communication apps on the internet by the US could have helped in containing the Pakistani terror groups' nefarious agenda in the region, officials connected to the suicide bombing probe said.

Interestingly, the Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) module that carried out the deadliest attack in the three decades of militancy in Jammu & Kashmir had used the YSMS app for communication among one another before executing the suicide bombing on a CRPF convoy leading to the death of 44 CRPF personnel. The app does not leave any signature on the Internet and can be traced only if the hardwares are intercepted.

The websites of Pakistan army/Inter Services Public Relations (ISPR) and its terror proxies Lashkar-e-Tayyiba (LeT) and JeM also hosted on a common server by American firm Cloudflare Inc which is a contradiction of the sanctions and bounties put on the heads of the terror masterminds of these two groups by the US under its terror listing regime. The server of the Pak-backed Referendum 2020 campaign targeting Khalistani movement is also located in the US and hosted by the Cloudflare Inc.

In addition, American

YSMS, a mobile application, was hosted on the 'dark web' and regulation of such communication apps on the Internet by the US could have helped in containing the Pakistani terror groups' nefarious agenda in the region

IEDs have been used by the terrorists in Jammu & Kashmir. The inimical forces, including Zakir Musa, a former Jaish commander who has since floated Ansar Ghatwatul Hind, subsequently rechristened as al-Qaeda Kashmir is seeking to develop remotely-operated vehicles for execution of bomb blasts in the Kashmir Valley.

Nepotism in UPPSC: CBI starts probe against officials

The CBI has registered a preliminary enquiry against unidentified officials of Uttar Pradesh Public Service Commission for allegedly granting favours to close relatives of public servants in an examination to select additional private secretaries during Mayawati's tenure as Chief Minister in 2010.

The PE is based on a complaint from the BJP-ruled Government in the State which subsequently sent to the CBI by the Central government in

January. It is alleged in the complaint that certain unidentified people including officials of the UPPSC committed irregularities and misconduct in the examination for about 250 posts of additional private secretaries in 2010, officials said.

The officials who have not been named in the PE extended undue favours to undeserving candidates. Some of the candidates who were the beneficiaries in the examination

did not fulfill even the basic minimum eligibility, the official said quoting from the complaint.

The complaint has alleged that some selected candidates are "close relatives" of public servants then serving the Uttar Pradesh Government which was headed by Mayawati from 2007-12, they said.

The officials of the UPPSC in alleged connivance with the examiners altered marks of

the candidates to enable their selection. The definition of public servants includes elected representatives who have taken oath of office.

On a question whether the "close relatives" were of elected representatives in the government, the official did not offer any comment saying, "These are allegations in the complaint from the state government. We have registered a preliminary enquiry."

The move of the agency became public on a day Samajwadi Party and Bahujan Samaj Party sealed their seat-sharing agreement for Lok Sabha polls to forge a formidable opposition against the ruling BJP.

The PE has no sanction under the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) and the suspects can refuse to even join the enquiry.

However, the agency can register a regular case (FIR) after gathering prima facie material to substantiate the allegations in the PE.

Leprosy has not declined, says IADVL

Contrary to the Government's claims that leprosy is on decline in the country, the Indian Association of Dermatologists Venereologists & Leprologists (IADVL) during its unique 63 days drive which culminated here on Thursday noted that there were high endemic pockets of the crippled disease and that patients were suffering with serious infectious cases.

"What is worrying is that in the last two three-years, and that what we also noticed during our drive undertaken in 18 States that we are seeing patients with multibacillary leprosy - the more severe form, which includes some of the most infectious cases," said Dr Mukesh Girdhar, national Vice President, IADVL.

He said such patients (multibacillary leprosy) need advanced and regular treat-

ment for longer duration. "Yes, there is resurgence of cases, severe cases. Disability index of these patients is definitely high. In fact some of the patients we received at our camp had bacteria droplets from their noses, making them highly infectious to their contacts," said Dr Girdhar, highlighting the gravity of the situation.

"Due to lack of public awareness there is a delay in diagnosis of leprosy," Dr Dinesh Kumar Devaraj, Joint Secretary IADVL said, adding most leprosy cases were from Odisha, Bihar, West Bengal, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra.

During the drive, the association reached out to more than 3,00,000 people with chronic cases as high as 95 per cent and recurrent cases as high as 60 per cent.

One of the other diseases that was widely prevalent was Vitiligo. More than 10 million Indians suffer from Vitiligo. Dr

Rohit Batra, dermatologist, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital and Chairman, IADVL People Connect Cell said that "Even though the prevalence of vitiligo is 1-2 per cent of the general population but we observed that out of all the people approached us during the drive it was more than 5 per cent."

Talking about fungal infection observed during the drive, Dr Girdhar, said, "There were a lot of patients suffering from fungal infections. We saw chronic cases as high as 95 per cent and recurrent cases as high as 60 per cent. Family members were affected up to 70 per cent and more than 80 per cent of child cases have an affected adult in family. Also, 50 to 70 per cent have used steroid creams for fungal infections."

Quackery is of major concern in these situations where Schedule H drugs are prescribed by unqualified people (quacks), said the experts.

Kisan Nidhi 1st instalment on Feb 24

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is likely to launch the direct income support scheme — Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi-PM-Kisan scheme and distribute the first instalment of Rs 2,000 during his visit to Gorakhpur and Prayagraj on February 24.

However, doubts are being raised over the implementation of the scheme in some non BJP States — Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. Both the States are seeking funds from the PM-Kisan yojna and want to distribute by their own to the beneficiary farmers.

As many as 1.22 crore small and marginal farmers have been enrolled by the Ministry of Agriculture till date for the PM Kisan scheme. The Modi Government intends to ensure release of first instalment to all eligible farmers — small and marginal — before the model code of conduct kicks in.

Top sources said that UP Government has enrolled over 70 lakh small and marginal

farmers under the scheme. The UP Government is working on war-footing to upload details of eligible farmers on the central database by Friday. Haryana Government has registered over 10 lakh such farmers.

"PM Modi will address the two-day national conclave of the BJP Kisan Morcha on Sunday and later release the money — Rs 2,000 per land holding — electronically to the bank accounts of farmers, mostly from Uttar Pradesh, with the click of a button," sources said. As per initial reports, over 1.22 crore farmers have been enrolled under the scheme across the country till date. The Ministry is Agriculture is working to enroll over two crore farmers by the time of launch of the scheme. As per estimate, there are 12 crore small and marginal farmers in the country.

According to sources, non-BJP State Government wants fund from the Centre and distribute it on their own while the Centre on the other hand, want to distribute to the ben-

eficiary by their own to get maximum political mileage in the upcoming Lok Sabha and Assembly polls. Earlier, the Odisha Government was not keen but now they have agreed to join the Centre's PM-Kisan scheme.

"Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has urged PM Modi to consider inclusion of landless labourers, sharecroppers and vulnerable households under the PM-KISAN, Assam and Jharkhand have sought explanation from the Centre over implementation of the scheme and West Bengal and Madhya Pradesh have asked for more time from the

Centre to implement the scheme," the sources said.

"The State Governments have to ensure that everybody who is a farmer and owns two hectares of land as on cut-off date subject to exclusions should be included. The significance of PM-KISAN is that, for the first time, an attempt has been made to transfer income directly to farmers without using price policy (of either inputs or output). In most of the programmes in the past, including those of previous governments, the policy instrument used has always been price," said the officials.

In the interim budget, the Modi Government announced direct income support of Rs 6,000 per year to 12.5 crore small and marginal farmers with land holding up to 2 hectares under the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana. Since the scheme was launched in retrospective effect from December 1, 2018, the first instalment of Rs 2,000 is due within the current fiscal year ending March 31, 2019.

Saudi significance

India's ties with Saudi Arabia have been symbiotic but it's important to balance the relationship



For some, it might seem incongruous that Prime Minister Narendra Modi received Crown Prince of Saudi Arabia, Mohammed bin-Salman (MbS), at the airport when the *de facto* ruler of the world's largest oil producer and effective leader of the Muslim world landed in India. MbS, as a young leader who styles himself in an attempt to be cool with young Saudis, had after all just gone to Pakistan merely days after the Pulwama attack and not even rapped the Pakistanis. But then, screamed critics in India, why was Narendra Modi going to receive MbS at the airport? He should have been given the same treatment that Justin Trudeau, the Canadian Prime Minister, got during his official visit last year thanks to the Khalistani links of that government.

The problem is that this is a complicated geopolitical issue that cannot really be brought down to simplistic arguments. The close ties between Saudi Arabia and Pakistan go back a long way, to the formation of Pakistan as a theocratic Islamist state. Saudi Arabia provided Pakistan with money and weapons during the 1965 and 1971 wars, and it was rumoured to have even provided fighter pilots. Pakistan plays a role for Saudi Arabia as well, it channelised Saudi money and citizens such as Osama bin Laden into Afghanistan where they fought as *mujahideen* against the Soviet Army in what became a "Holy War" of sorts. Given the shortage of Saudi citizens wanting to be enlisted soldiers, Pakistani citizens make up large numbers in that nation's army. And it was Pakistani special forces that finally helped the Saudi state and the ruling al-Saud family during the dramatic 1979 rebellion in Mecca when the Kaaba itself was stormed. Today, Pakistan is a pawn in Saudi Arabia's undeclared war with Shia Iran. So when MbS says that Pakistan has the potential for \$20 billion in investment, he is in essence repaying a debt to Pakistan.

Therefore, some might ask why India should entertain a man so obviously allied with Pakistan. Of course, India's huge Muslim population is the most obvious reason, so keeping MbS and the Saudi state at least partially on one's side is the intelligent thing to do. And it is no secret that Modi has received very few leaders at the airport, MbS and previously Benjamin Netanyahu, Prime Minister of Israel, being two of them. India plays a critical role between those two nations, in fact that is why Air India got over-flying rights over Saudi Arabia for its Tel Aviv flight. And then there is the simple fact that Saudi Arabia is home to millions of Indians and the remittances they send here are still important to our economy. MbS wants to encourage the 'Saudiisation' of the job force in his country which will be detrimental to Indian workers, so keeping him on our side is strategic. Of course, Saudi Arabia is and will remain one of the largest suppliers of oil to India and now as it prepares for a post-oil future, its funds to India's start-up economy matter as well. MbS is no hero, his role in the brutal murder of columnist Jamal Khashoggi and the way he went after his rivals in the Saudi court should worry people. But we have little choice but to keep Saudi Arabia happy. However, it is plainly clear that MbS is learning on the job and has realised that prickling India is not the way to go even for him.

India then stands at the crossroads. While every Indian, I am sure, agrees that such acts of terror must not go unpunished and should be avenged, the question for us as Indians is: What constitutes a befitting reply? Is it a reply that is ill-thought out, reactionary and detrimental to India's interests and values in the long-term or is it one where we emerge stronger and show the enemies of our country that while its enemies will try creating a divide through cowardly acts of terror, our country will continue to stand unafraid and unmoved. We must refuse to give up those values, which distinguish us from failed states that have long ago given up the ideals of a prosperous and democratic society.

No gods in Tamil Nadu

Minus the monolithic Jayalalithaa and Karunanidhi, the state will give a mixed verdict



For the first time in Tamil Nadu, elections won't be about demi-gods in the absence of J Jayalalithaa and M Karunanidhi, the two leaders who had become larger than life enough to not only dominate state politics but alternately become kingmakers in national governments with plum portfolios. And considering the southern state along with Puducherry has a sizeable 40 seats in the Lok Sabha, all national parties or coalitions have courted them at one time or the other. There have been stories about getting a rare audience with the imperious Jayalalithaa after hours of waiting at her Poes Garden residence and confabulations with the closest aide of Karunanidhi to convey messages from Delhi. So yes, with their passing, there is a political vacuum which their successors may not be able to fill. Despite best intentions. And though both the AIADMK and DMK are looking at national parties, the former aligning with the BJP and the latter with the Congress, to cushion themselves from a great fall, fact is both, in their current denuded state, may for the first time give their national counterparts a confidence to make good in Tamil Nadu on their own. They themselves might just become survivors rather than captains of their destiny. Contrary to the two icons, who have always looked outward as nobody challenged their heavyweight status at home, their parties at this time are looking inward, hoping their alliances will decide their fate in the Assembly elections.

Let's look at the AIADMK, the giant killer of the 2014 elections, and its tie-up with the BJP, which is not exactly riding a Modi wave this time. But it is the best fertile ground for both to pull each other up, especially now that the BJP has mended fences with its erstwhile ally, the PMK. One doesn't know whether Jayalalithaa's posters or videos will have the same effect as her live campaigns but the AIADMK under Chief Minister Edappadi Palaniswami is clearly fearing a sizeable fall in vote share. Torn by dissension and faction fights, he has safely staked the party's future in only 25 seats. Besides, the nephew of Jayalalithaa's aide Sasikala, TTV Dhinakaran, is likely to take a big bite of the AIADMK's vote pie. Dhinakaran is nowhere trying to appropriate Amma's aura but away from the alliance photo sessions, he is campaigning in the villages, emerging to be the only leader after her to put Tamil Nadu first and talk about people's issues. Voters feel Palaniswami has not stood up enough in the Cauvery water dispute or the Sterlite protests. Besides, Dhinakaran has an excellent ground network in southern Tamil Nadu. Of course, the PMK, given its past vote share, could steady the northern votes for the AIADMK-led alliance. But nobody expects a blockbuster performance, though every incremental seat for the BJP could only help in making up a projected deficit in its national tally. Technically, the DMK scion MK Stalin has a slight edge and is following his astute father's template in stitching up a pact with the Congress. First, the DMK is better off than 2014, when the 2G scam did it in and it fought without allies, its voteshare plummeting in a free fall. Now that Raja and M Kanimozhi are acquitted in the 2G case, the DMK and the Congress are hoping to regain their 2009 vote share of around 44 per cent. Meanwhile, actor Kamal Haasan could emerge vote cutter than the new god. Tamil Nadu seems to be setting an all-new template of hand-holders.

February 14, 2019, will henceforth be remembered as a day marred by the horrific images of a cowardly act of terror where more than 40 Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) soldiers were killed in Pulwama. The suicide bomber, Adil Ahmad Dar, who has been identified as the culprit of this dastardly act, detonated close to 60 kilos of explosives near a convoy of CRPF soldiers. The Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) has claimed responsibility for this act of terror and it has been widely reported that the JeM has been supported and enabled by the Government of Pakistan. There is no denying the fact that this was a day of mourning for India but it is crucial that this incident also becomes an inflection point where India provides a befitting reply to its enemies and emerges stronger than before.

India then stands at the crossroads. While every Indian, I am sure, agrees that such acts of terror must not go unpunished and should be avenged, the question for us as Indians is: What constitutes a befitting reply? Is it a reply that is ill-thought out, reactionary and detrimental to India's interests and values in the long-term or is it one where we emerge stronger and show the enemies of our country that while its enemies will try creating a divide through cowardly acts of terror, our country will continue to stand unafraid and unmoved. We must refuse to give up those values, which distinguish us from failed states that have long ago given up the ideals of a prosperous and democratic society.

I am just as angry and livid at the attack as any patriot but at a time like this, it is important to remember the words of Aristotle, who had said, "Anybody can become angry — that is easy, but to be angry with the right person and to the right degree and at the right time and for the right purpose and in the right way — that is not within everybody's power and is not easy." In this week's column, I will attempt to show how India can show its enemies that not only is the country capable of taking hard decisions and demonstrate that these acts of terror will not be taken lying down but also that it will emerge stronger because of them.

Establish a Commission after such acts of terror: In the aftermath of 9/11, the US instituted the 9/11 Commission, which was an independent, bipartisan body consisting of not only Republicans and Democrats but also staff members, who were experts in various fields. The Commission was charged with preparing a complete report of the circumstances surrounding the terrorist attack on the World Trade Centre and the Pentagon on September 11, 2001. The report examined the preparedness of the US and also provided recommendations to guard against such future attacks. It is imperative that with acts of terror such as the recent one in Pulwama, India responds similarly. As part of the 9/11 Commission report, the

A befitting reply

body examined the chronology of events on September 11, 2001, right from early 1999, when the hijackers prepared for the attack while living in Germany till the point when the planes had been hijacked by the terrorists. At each point in the chronology of events, the Commission submitted expert suggestions on how to plug each and every lapse that led to the 9/11 attacks. It is imperative that India draws a similar approach by constituting a commission of experts, which examines the chronology of events that ultimately led to the February 14 attack and debate this report in Parliament. Ultimately, this report should be made public since such a step will help heap public pressure and prevent such lapses in the future.

While understandably, there is a lot of anger in our country over these attacks, some of the reactions to it are

questionable and are, in fact, aiding our enemies. The first type of reaction is one that demands an all-out war against another nuclear power. Unsurprisingly, a number of these calls are from individuals, who have the luxury to opine without the threat of consequence. The more rational voices on the subject are typically from soldiers and members of the armed forces, who understand the cost of war and, perhaps, more significantly, the cost of rashness in a battlefield.

For example, if India does execute its response without adequate preparedness and at an inopportune time, it will run the huge risk of losing more brave soldiers, not because of an act of terror but due to rashness. Such an outcome is unacceptable. While desire for revenge is normal, it cannot be at the cost of reckless disregard for an Indian life. That outcome, in my opinion, is unacceptable. While there are always casualties in war, it is difficult to justify such casualties if they are a result of aggression.

The other type of reaction we have seen is the targeting of Kashmiris across India. This, too, is a response that cannot be justified and must be condemned. First, from a humane perspective, we must recognise that the minute we take out our anger on

an entire community due to our pain over terrorist attacks, we lose humanity, something that distinguishes us from the cowardly terrorists, who attack India and what it stands for.

All of us, including all political parties, must come out clearly and unequivocally against this behaviour. We must recognise that such a reaction is what the forces, that seek to divide India, actually hope to achieve. Creating divides within the country so that we turn on each other makes any future acts of terror easier for our enemies. We must not allow the enemies of the country inflict that sort of irreparable damage.

An examination of acts of terror throughout the world shows that rarely if ever are acts of terror random acts of violence. Instead, they are thoroughly planned and ruthlessly executed. Therefore, in order to be truly effective, our response must also demonstrate our ability to be patient and cause maximum damage at the most appropriate time. While it may be easy to give in to our more basic demands for immediate revenge, I think we can demand better from ourselves and emerge stronger as a result of it.

Alliance politics in Chennai

The battle lines are drawn in Tamil Nadu. The formalisation of the alliance between the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK) followed by the Congress' seat-sharing agreement with the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) means the choice before the electorate has been limited to these two alliances. Whether TTV Dhinakaran's Amma Makkal Munnetra Kazhagam (AMMK) upstages the EPS-OPS-led AIADMK remains to be seen. If Kamal Haasan's Makkal Needhi Maiyam decides to go solo, it will have only an outside chance.

In the AIADMK-BJP combine, it is a clear case of one party piggybacking on another. The BJP and the AIADMK are not natural allies but an opportunistic combine. As a Dravidian party, AIADMK subscribes or should subscribe to the conception of social justice by Periyar and not to the Hindutva ideology espoused by the BJP. No wonder, the BJP-AIADMK alliance is widely perceived to be an 'alliance of convenience.' On the other hand,



the DMK-Congress alliance is more compatible as their ideologies may be divergent but not antithetical. The anger against the Modi Government and EPS Government or anti-incumbency sentiment is strong and palpable in the State. For the formation of the next Government at the Centre, which alliance (and not which party) wins is what will count to the last seat.

Waiting for polls in Nigeria

Nigerian politicians switch parties as often as they change wives. You would think that such a system could not survive but it still does

Lengthy delays before announcing the results of African elections are commonplace (the Democratic Republic of Congo last month, Zimbabwe last July, etc.). It just means that people voted the wrong way, and the Government needs time to re-arrange the results before publishing them. Postponing the vote at the last moment is much less common, and not so easy to explain. That's what happened in Nigeria last week. Only five hours before the polls were due to open, the Independent National Election Commission postponed the election for a week, citing as reasons attempted sabotage, bad weather and problems with delivering the ballot papers. It's weird but it's hard to see who benefits from it. It may be down to simple incompetence.

There are 79 candidates for the presidency but only two count. The incumbent, former general Muhammadu Buhari, is running again despite a less than stellar performance in his first term as an elected President. (He also held the office as a military dictator for 20 months in the 1980s, before being overthrown by another general.) Buhari won power in 2015 by claiming to be a born-again democrat and a 'new broom' who would sweep away corruption and many Nigerians dared to believe him. He was the first Opposition candidate ever to win a free presidential election. But four years later, Nigeria has fallen another 12 places on Transparency International's corruption index: It now ranks 144th out of 180 countries, just ahead of Mauritania.

Buhari is personally clean but his anti-corruption measures almost exclusively targeted politicians of other parties. Nigerian average incomes fell by more than a third and unemployment doubled on his watch (mostly because of the collapse in oil prices). He didn't deliver on his promise to eliminate the Islamists extremists of Boko Haram, affiliated with the Islamic State (IS), who have terrorised the north-east of the country. He is also so lethargic, perhaps due to chronic illness, that he is popularly known as 'Baba-Go-Slow'. He took six months to name his Cabinet and he was abroad so long on sick leave (five months) that when he finally came home, conspiracy theorists claimed that he had died and been replaced by a body double (Jubril from Sudan) who had undergone plastic surgery.

Buhari should lose, and he probably will, because three ex-generals (all former Presidents), who once backed him, have switched to his challenger, businessman Atiku Abubakar. 'Atiku' is a billionaire who started out as a humble customs officer. People speculate that this made him very useful to generals and other powerful people, who wanted to parlay a small fortune into a big one. Be that as it may, Atiku then went into the oilfield supply business and prospered mightily (maybe with a little help from his friends). He served two terms as Vice President, after the first of which, he was accused of having diverted \$125 million of public funds to his own business interests.

A US Senate report in 2010 accused him of having transferred \$40m of "suspect funds" to the US, using his American wife's bank account but he has never faced a court. But he vows to use his skills as an entrepreneur to sort out the country. If he succeeds, and some of the money sticks to him, who cares? At least it can be said on his behalf that he supports Arsenal. This is the choice that faces Nigeria and it's really no choice at all. Both candidates embody exactly the characteristics that define the country's problems. First, they are very old — Muhammadu Buhari is 72, Atiku Abubakar is 72 — in a country where half the voters are under 35, and half the population is under 18. The country is run by a congeries of mostly rich old men, mainly for their own benefit and it has been, thus, ever since the return of democracy 20 years ago. Before that, it was run by a bunch of somewhat younger soldiers, also mostly for their own benefit.

Nigerian politicians switch parties as often as they change wives, and show only rhetorical concern for the 10 million young people who are unemployed. You would think that such a system could not survive and perhaps, one day, it will be swept away but there is no sign of it happening in this election. The other thing the two chief presidential candidates have in common is a plethora of children. Buhari has 10 offspring from two marriages (one after the other). Abubakar has 28 children from four marriages (simultaneous). Humble people can't afford quite that many but most people are doing their bit to ensure that Nigeria's population outgrows its resources. This is a sensitive topic, but not to talk about it is to ignore Nigeria's biggest problem. In 1960, it had a quarter of the population of the US. Now it has more than half as many people and by 2050, it will overtake the US to become the world's third most populous nation. At that point, it will have over 400 million people. Nigeria is only slightly larger than Texas (28 million). It will probably be a 'free and fair' poll, but it won't change any of that.

Words without meaning

Though general elections are a few months away, the BJP and the Congress are simply attacking each other. Will they pull out a rabbit from their hats and bring a fresh narrative?

After Priyanka Gandhi Vadra's entry into active politics, our grand old party, the Congress, looks energised, motivated and has the momentum on its side to face the 2019 Lok Sabha election. Of course, it has been helped in no small measure by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which now looks jaded, carries the disadvantage of anti-incumbency and is seemingly devoid of the same energy and enthusiasm that marked the party's campaign throughout 2013 till the 2014 general election. Despite being on a roll — to an extent as Congress supporters would like to believe — after last year's victories in the Assembly elections to Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh, this would be the first battle in recent years where the grand old party, which by default is the main challenger to the BJP, is yet to come out with a positive poll narrative or sound implementable promises. It needs a pitch, now.

Rather than projecting any positive agenda for the creation of jobs, to boost the country's economy or putting forth any dynamic agenda which it might have for foreign policy vis-à-vis our neighbouring countries, all it is dependent this time around is on the "failure" of the Modi regime to fulfill promises it made in 2014. As of now, Rafale seems to be the single most important agenda for the Opposition, even as the ruling party is spiritedly defending itself and has been denying any wrong doing. Attack, attack and attack... seems to be the Congress' mantra as it enters the last phase before the elections are formally announced by the Election Commission of India. But Rafale doesn't have the ability to wash with the electorate as an emotional issue. Can the Modi Government's alleged failure, therefore, become the trump card for the Congress? If the party's think-tank believes it can take the electoral plunge without any positive agenda, or without any performance-oriented narrative, it is, perhaps, going through a delusional phase. There will be near unanimity among non-BJP parties and also a large section of the academia and economists that demonetisation was a blunder and that the implementation of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) could have been done in a better way, and perhaps, in a phased manner. There can be no argument on this front. But can this failure of the ruling party become the main weapon of the Congress fightback?

At present, all that the Congress has offered include loan-waivers to farmers in States like Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan, where the party won last year, triggering speculation that it would do well in the general elections too. But can loan-waiver alone be the panacea of all the ills that plague the farming community? No farmer, agriculturist or expert dealing with the farm economy and farm crisis thinks so. At best, it is a pill which can only remove the symptom but can never fight the cause of the disease.

So, what can the Congress offer to the farmers of the country? Farm distress is, perhaps, the single most reason to make the Modi Government unpopular among the rural vote-base. Low farm prices have ensured that the



farmers' returns from investments in crop, seeds, fertilisers and land are reduced and have, in fact, come down significantly in recent years. But will the Congress implement the recommendations of the Swaminathan Commission report, which advocates a new mechanism for fixing Minimum Support Price for their crops? We have not heard much from the party on this front except some vague promises.

In fact, even in Punjab, where the party has been in power for almost two years now, and which is plagued by farm distress and farmers' suicides for long, we are yet to hear much except that provisions for cosmetic loan-waivers have been made. Farmers continue to be stressed in the State even though the Congress under Capt Amarinder Singh took over the reins of power almost two years ago.

If you do not have anything concrete on the farm front, that's fine, you can take a call later. But what are your plans about job creation and giving impetus to the economy? There is no denying that demonetisation, which was followed by GST in quick succession, affected job growth. In fact, the combine triggered massive job losses. Has the Congress come up with a plan to infuse new life to the economy and create jobs? The answer obviously would be a big no.

In 2014, when Prime Minister Narendra Modi was bidding for power at the Centre, he, too, attacked the Congress left, right and centre, using every possible imagery to pin down the party and expose its inner contradictions. This was similar to what the Congress is doing right now. At that time, Modi found traction among voters with three crucial words — Modi, Modi, Modi — that echoed in almost all public meetings in the Hindi heartland throughout the campaign period. But at the same time, while tomtomming his personal charisma, he had also come out with slogans of creating two crore jobs every year and gifting 15 lakh in every bank account from the black money which was supposedly parked in foreign accounts. Of course,

the promise of *achhe din* acted as the catalyst that distilled hope among a large section of the population, cutting across caste and religious lines.

Five years down the line, all of these largely remain a promise and the slogans raised then have been given a decent burial. Even the "Gujarat model of development", which was supposed to be implemented at the national level, remains forgotten and no one hears anything about it anymore. What Modi and his party are doing this time around is what they did in 2014 — virulently attack the Congress. Dynasty and alleged acts of omission and commission are the top subjects on which the grand old party can be attacked. There is no attempt to even sell a rescue plan for stressed Indians.

So, there you are: Both the main contenders are calling each other names, they want the people to believe that the other is corrupt and are trying to attract the voters' eyeballs with their colourful vocabulary, which they are using against each other. What catapulted the BJP under Modi in 2014 was complete disillusionment with 10 years of UPA regime, charges of big ticket corruption, perception of a remote-controlled Prime Minister and loss of hope among the electorate for the future. Modi brought in a wave of fresh air, positive change, political machismo and above all, hope for *achhe din* with some specific policy measures.

In the absence of a positive narrative among both contenders for power — BJP and Congress — electioneering so far has been reduced to charges and counter charges, attack and defence. Of course, real electioneering is yet to pick up and will be seen only after the nation gets over the Pulwama tragedy. But people are still wondering if elections this time round would be fought on negative agenda, making both sides look opportunist than committed visionaries who will see us through.

Give political *shakti* to women

Increasingly, women have shown equal, if not greater, understanding of their role as leaders. But obstacles are many and they have to triumph over them. Most important of all, the power to give women a chance still rests with the men

When many of the guests left her wedding reception because of the terrible smell emanating from unhygienic conditions prevailing in her village in Maharashtra, Madhuri Sawant was determined to change things. It took 14 years of single-minded determination to overcome a rigid mindset and conditioning but Sawant ensured that her village was among the 12 villages from Maharashtra to win the first Nirmal Gram Puraskar, an award instituted by the Union Government in October, 2003, to promote rural sanitation. Sawant's village beat 443 contenders from 10 States to win the award given to panchayats

or local self-governments, that have ensured that all households have access to toilets; are free of open defecation; and have separate toilets for boys and girls in schools and anganwadi centres.

Although Sawant started her campaign much before she became the village's first woman *pradhan*, holding an office made it easier for her to push for sanitation and developmental work. It was her ability to catalyse change that catapulted her village to the top.

Sawant is not the only one who has been bringing change. There are innumerable examples of how the leadership of women in *panchayats* is transforming India and have been underlining why there is an urgent need for an increase in women's participation in the political system. Their presence in the village not only inspires other women but increases aspirations among families with daughters.

When women are seen taking up responsibilities of village leaders, which are traditionally appro-

riated by men, others are motivated to try and follow in their footsteps. Research has shown that perceptions of women as leaders improve when they are seen and heard at village meetings.

Studies have proven that women's representation in local Governments can make a tangible difference. For example, the number of drinking water projects in areas with women-led *panchayats* was 62 per cent higher than in those that were led by men. Further, women legislators enhance economic performance in their constituencies by about 1.8 percentage points per year more than male legislators. Women legislators are more effective at completing road projects and, hence, creating infrastructure for growth, according to a recent study by the United Nations University.

Additionally, by improving educational outcomes for girls, these women leaders lay the foundation for increasing their participation in the labour force and, thereby, closing the gap of male-to-female work-

ing population in India.

Even at the national level, women's leadership in the political decision-making processes champions issues of development, gender justice, elimination of gender-based violence, gender-equality laws, healthcare and safety of women, irrespective of party affiliation. Despite their low numbers, (women constitute 12.2 per cent of the MPs in the 16th Lok Sabha and 11.5 per cent in the Rajya Sabha), women have shown equal, if not greater, understanding of their role in Parliament.

While women MPs on an average asked 234 questions in the Lok Sabha, compared to 236 questions by men MPs, female MPs on average participated in more debates (56) than their male counterparts (55), according to data collected by PRS Legislative Research for the 16th Lok Sabha (June 1, 2014, to July 31, 2018).

Incidentally, female voter turnout was higher than male turnout in 16 States and Union Territories out of 35 in the last gen-

eral elections in 2014. Can this be translated into greater participation of women as candidates? Yes, says a recent survey by Shakti, a non-partisan inclusive platform of women across the country.

On being asked whether they wanted more women MPs in Lok Sabha in 2019 elections, Shakti received an affirmative answer from 10 lakh registered voters across the rural, urban, women, men and youth spectrum. Their Shakti-Neta App survey recorded 82.2 per cent 'YES' across 24 States.

But first, political parties have to give women a chance to contest the elections. Only 8.8 per cent tickets were given to women candidates by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and 12.9 per cent by the Congress in the 2014 general election. Will it be different this time around? Will women be able to overcome prevailing cultural attitudes regarding gender roles, lack of finances and the threat of violence?

That it is possible for women to triumph over these obstacles has been shown by Jayanti, a young

woman from the backward Sahariya tribe in the Lalitpur district of Uttar Pradesh. Jayanti's journey from a daily-wage labourer to a *pradhan* symbolises the growing political empowerment and coming of age of many marginalised women.

In the feudal and backward Bundelkhand region of the State, these women are now more willing to participate actively in the electoral process. Jayanti stood her ground despite threats and coercion to withdraw from the elections.

Even the announcement that she had lost by four votes did not break her spirit. She exercised her right to a recount and was vindicated when she was declared the winner by a thin margin of six votes. Since then she has resolved problems related to the mid-day meals old age pension cards and roads.

The power to give women a chance still rests with the men. Now is the moment to prove that commitments for women-led development don't remain mere rhetoric.

BHIMA KOREGAON-ELGAAR PARISHAD CASE

Supplementary chargesheet filed in court

The Pune police on Thursday filed a 1,837-page supplementary chargesheet before a Pune court against five more persons, including human rights activist Sudha Bharadwaj and fugitive Maoist leader Ganapathy alias Chandrashekar, in connection with the much-discussed Elgaar Parishad-cum-Bhima-Koregaon riots case.

Three months after they filed the first charge sheet against ten accused in the same case, the Pune police filed a comprehensive charge-sheet before the Additional Sessions Judge Kishor Vadane.

Apart from Bharadwaj and Ganapathy, the three other accused named in the supplementary chargesheet are, Telugu poet Varavara Rao, activists Vernon Gonsalves and Arun Pereira.

Like in the case of the earlier charge-sheet, the five activists have been charged under various relevant sections of the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA), 117 (abetting commission of offence), 120-b (conspiracy)

read with 34 (common intention), 121, 121 (A) (Waging or attempting to wage a war, or abetting waging of war, against the Government of India) 124A (sedition), 153 -A (wantonly giving provocation with intent to cause riot...) and 505-1b (statements conducting public mischief) of Indian Penal Code (IPC)

Confirming that a supplementary charge-sheet had been filed in the local court, Pune's Joint Commissioner of Police Shivaji Bodkhe said on Thursday, "The evidence that we have produced against the five accused includes evidence retrieved from electronic devices seized from the arrested activists. We have charged them with waging war against the nation and spreading the ideology of their banned organisation and creating caste conflicts, disaffection and hatred in the society."

On November 15 last year, the Pune police had filed the first chargesheet before a special court in Pune against 10 persons in the Bhima-Koregaon riots case, accusing them among other things of conspiring to kill Prime

Minister Narendra Modi and overthrow the democratically elected government in the country.

In their chargesheet filed before a Special Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) Court in Pune ten weeks after the same court extended a 90-day deadline for filing the charge-sheet by another 90 days, the Pune police had named Sudhir P. Dhawale, Rona J Wilson, Surendra P Gadling, Shoma Sen, Mahesh S. Raut as among the 10 persons. They had been arrested from various parts of the country on June 6.

The five other accused named in their charge-sheet as the absconding accused by the Pune police were M alias Milind Telumbde with Yavatmal, Prakash alias Navin

Alias Ritupan Goswami from Assam, Manglu, Dipu and Kishan Prashant Bose, all owing allegiance to the banned CPI (Maoists). The charge-sheet stated that these five accused had gone "underground" in various parts of the country.

The ten accused named in the first charge-sheet in the Bhima-Koregaon case have been charged under the same sections as is the case with the five accused, including Bharadwaj, against whom the supplementary charge-sheet was filed on Thursday.

The charge-sheet had stated that the five-arrested activists --Dhawale, Wilson, Gadling, Shoma Sen and S. Raut --were linked to the CPI (Maoists) which carried out subversive activities through under-

ground means. Human and civil rights organisations like Indian Association of People's Lawyers (IAPL), Anuradha Ghandi Memorial Committee (AGMC), Kabir Kala Manch, all of which set up legally, were supporting the outlawed CPI (Maoists)

According to the charge-sheet, accused number two Rona J Wilson had colluded with Shoma Sena and Prashant Bose, secretary of the outlawed CPI (Maoist)'s Eastern Regional Bureau, along with other underground activists hatched a conspiracy to kill the Prime Minister of India.

Like in the case of the previous ten accused, the current five have been charged with "waging a war" against the nation.

Five Maoist-linked activists Human Rights activists Rona Wilson Jacob, Surendra Gadling, Sudhir Dhawale, Prof Shoma Sen and Mahesh Raut were arrested by the Pune police on June 6, in connection with the Elgaar Parishad and subsequent Bhima-Koregaon caste riots.

Subsequently on June 8, the

investigators had claimed that they had recovered from the laptop of Wilson an allegedly incriminating letter, which uncovered an alleged plot by the Maoists to carry out "Rajiv Gandhi-type" assassination of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

On August 28, the Pune police arrested five more activists Varavara Rao, Vernon Gonsalves and Arun Pereira, Sudha Bharadwaj and Gautam Navlakra for their association with the Elgaar Parishad held in Pune a day ahead of the January 1, 2018 Bhima-Koregaon riots and their alleged links with the Maoists.

It may be recalled that on January 1, one Rahul Phatangale (28), a Dalit, was killed and another 40-odd vehicles and some other property were damaged after some miscreants attacked Dalits celebrating the January 1, 1818 victory of British troops over Peshwa Bajirao II's army at Bhima-Koregaon in Pune district of western Maharashtra. Following the incident, Maharashtra had witnessed large-scale Dalit protests which turned violent at some places.

DMDK proves to be tough, seeks more seats from AIADMK

The AIADMK which staged a 'coup' on Tuesday by roping in the PMK to its fold for facing the Lok Sabha election, came across an unexpected road block by Thursday as Vijaykanth of the DMDK demanded seven constituencies for his party to fight the election.

Vijaykanth has reportedly told the AIADMK representative who called on him that during the 2014 Lok Sabha election, his party was allocated 14 seats by the BJP while the PMK was given only seven seats. The AIADMK had signed a deal with the PMK on Tuesday allocating seven seats and a Rajya Sabha seat for the Vanniyar dominated party.

While the AIADMK had smooth negotiations with the PMK and the BJP, Vijaykanth is proving himself to be a tough nut. The situation turned curious on Thursday as S Thirunavakarassar, the former TNCC president called on the actor-turned-politician at the latter's residence in Chennai.

The Congress leader who spent nearly 30 minutes with the actor and his family later told

reporters that his visit was to wish Vijaykanth best of health and a speedy recovery. "We spoke politics also and I requested him to take a decision keeping the national interests in mind," he said.

Sources close to the actor said that Vijaykanth has some "accounts to settle" with the AIADMK, which he claims was instrumental in decimating his outfit after the 2011 assembly election. The DMDK which contested the 2011 assembly election as an ally of the AIADMK had won 29 seats and Vijaykanth was the Leader of the Opposition. But 14 MLAs belonging to the DMDK switched over to the AIADMK camp. Vijaykanth believes that it was at the instance of Jayalalitha, the then chief minister that the MLAs ditched him.

If the AIADMK parts with seven seats to the DMDK, the ruling party would be left with just 19 seats. There are parties like Puthiya Tamilagam, TMC and fringe parties which too have to be accommodated in the front, which is causing anxiety to the AIADMK leadership.

The DMK had on Wednesday allocated nine seats in Tamil Nadu and the lone seat in Puducherry to the Congress.

Omar: Our students are being targeted, why PM is silent

Hours after former Chief Minister Omar Abdullah questioned Prime Minister Narendra Modi's silence on Kashmiri students being targeted in various parts of the country J&K Governor Satya Pal Malik on Thursday denied reports of attacks on students.

Addressing a press conference in Srinagar Omar told reporters, "All over the country but especially in some areas, an entire population is being maligned. Our students outside the State, with no connection to politics, are being targeted and expelled. This is nothing but a conspiracy. Why is the Centre silent on it?"

Reacting to Omar's statement on a TV debate Governor Satya Pal Malik later said "I don't want to comment on what Omar said but, I can tell you something for your information, there are approximately 22000-25000 Kashmiri students studying outside J&K, not a single student has even been slapped".

He said, "At eleven locations we had appointed liaison

officers 6 months ago, these officers took care of them and maintained co-ordination with the State Government and kept the students safe. Even yesterday in Dehradun Kashmiri students stated that there was no risk or danger to them and PDP people there were creating a false ruckus. There is an attempt to create an issue where there is no issue, just to communalise before the elections and I don't want to react to such childish man."

During the press conference Omar had also slammed Congress and said not just the ruling party and the PM, but even the opposition has been absolutely silent on this issue. Referring to possibility of dialogue between India and Pakistan Omar said, "talks with Pakistan cannot be held with the backdrop of terror attacks such as the one in Pulwama, in which 40 CRPF jawans were killed. "Our PM has talked about a 'muh tod jawab' but such a reply is not possible in the current situation as the Pakistan PM has also stated that they would not think of but retaliate if any attack is launched by India," Abdullah said.

POST-PULWAMA BACKLASH Yuva Sena workers beaten up 4 Kashmiri students in Maha

In a disturbing incident that took place a week after the Pulwama terror attack, four Kashmiri students were humiliated, beaten up and forced by Yuv Sena activists to raise slogans like "Vande Mataram", "Hindustan Zindabad" and "Bharatmata ki Jai" at Yavatmal in eastern Maharashtra.

Umar Rashid Dar (19) and Umar Nazir Ganai (20) both from Kupwara in Jammu and Kashmir and two of their other friends from the same state were caught hold of near their rented homes at Yavatmal late on Wednesday night, beaten up and forced to raise slogans hailing India, by the Yuv Sena activists.

The victim students are from Dayabhai Patel College of Physical Education. The Yuv Sena activists accosted them near their rented homes in Waghapur Road area of the town and physically harassed them as a mark of "protest" against the Pulwama terror strike in which 40 CRPF jawans were killed. Two of the jawans from the neighbouring Buldhana district were among those killed in the Pulwama attack.

A clip of video footage shot by the Yuv Sena activists themselves went viral on social media on Thursday. The footage showed a local Yuv Sena leader beating the Kashmiri students and asking them questions like to from where they were, as to why they had come to

Yavatmal and whether were they linked with terrorists. "What is your name? Why have you come here? You should not come here... What connection do you with the terrorists there?... You relatives are killing our jawans there. Why have you come here? How many students are here like you in Yavatmal".

The replies from a student like "I have to come to study here... I am the son of a doctor. I have not been to Kashmir for the last one and a half years...There are 15 to 20 Kashmiri students in Yavatmal (the Yuv Sena leader tells the student: Tell them not to be here)" would not satisfy the Yuv Sena leader who continued to beat him and other students up.

The footage of the incident also showed the Yuv Sena leader order the victim Kashmiri students to raise slogans like "Hindustan Zindabad", "Vande Mataram" and "Bharat Mata ki Jai". The victim students readily obliged the Yuv Sena leader.

Incidentally, the incident took place four days after Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited the Yavatmal town to launch several development projects. In his speech, Modi said that however the perpetrators of Pulwama mayhem "will definitely be punished" and the security forces had been given a "free hand" to deal with the counter-attack they deemed fit.

Following the incident, the Yuva Sena came in for sharp criticism from various quarters. In a damage control exercise, Yuv Sena

president Aditya Thackeray urged his supporters not to vent their anger against "people from our own country" all in the name of "showing their anger against Pakistan".

"I think the outrage was against Pakistan and the need to give it a fitting reply is important... But we must ensure that this is not directed at our own citizens in any manner," Aditya said.

"What has happened is not proper and highly condemnable. If they are our members we would take action against them," Yuva Sena secretary Varun Sardesai said. Meanwhile, the local Lohara police station has registered a case in connection with the incident. "We are recording the statements of the victims and we would soon identify the accused," Yavatmal's district superintendent of police M Rajkumar said.

Extending support to the victim students, Dayabhai Patel College of Physical Education Sandeep Chawak said: "We are with the affected students. Three of the four victim students are studying in our college for the past three years, while the remaining one has been here for the past one year".

A team of police led by DSP Rajkumar visited the college, interacted with the students and assured them that there would not be any repeat of such incidents. "We have increased the security and patrolling around homes where the Kashmiri boys stay," Rajkumar told the students.

Jammu police files case for shouting anti-national slogans

Jammu: Cracking whip against the anti-national elements, the Jammu and Kashmir police has registered a case against those involved in pro-Pakistan and anti-India sloganeering outside GGM Science College in Jammu on February 11.

According to police spokesman, "FIR has been registered under Sections sedition (124A RPC), Punishment for wrongful restraint (341), Punishment for rioting (147) rioting, armed with deadly weapon (148) and endangering life or personal safety of others (336) against unidentified persons".

As per the hue and cry notice issued by SSP Jammu Tejinder Singh, SP city North, Jammu has intimated that some unknown persons have raised anti-national slogans near the college, out of which the pictures of three unidentified persons have been traced out and are wanted in the FIR.

"As such photographs of these unidentified persons are being published for the information of police establishments and public in general, having any clue related to whereabouts and present locations of these accused persons, communicate the same on the contacts of police," the notice said.

Police had gathered mobile/CCTV footage from local businessmen to identify these persons involved in anti-India sloganeering.

College students had boycotted their classes for three days after police lathicharged them inside the GGM science college premises while they were protesting against stranded passengers for raising anti-India and prok Pakistan slogans in Jammu. PNS

MHA will carry out survey to assess citizen-centric police services

The Union Home Ministry will carry out a pan-India survey to assess public perception on citizen-centric police services like women safety and reporting of crimes, officials said Thursday. The survey will commence next month and cover a representative sample of 1.2 lakh households spread over 173 districts across the country, based on the National Sample Survey framework.

All the states and the Union Territories would be included in this survey and it will be completed in nine months, a Home Ministry official said.

The survey is aimed to understand public perception about police, gauge the level of non-reporting of crimes or incidents to police, the position on ground relating to crime reporting and recording, timeliness and quality of police response and action and experience about women and children's safety.

The outcome of the survey is expected to bring out useful suggestions for stakeholders in formulating and implementing appropriate policy responses and changes in the functioning of police at the cutting edge and for improving crime prevention and investigation, transformation in community policing.

It is also expected to improve the access to the justice and increased or appropriate resource allocation for police in a systematic manner, the official said.

From time-to-time, several initiatives have been taken by the central government, aimed at facilitating and supplementing the efforts of state governments and the Union Territories in providing citizen-centric police services.


A globally accepted way to assess the impact or outcomes of such endeavours is through a holistic analysis of services rendered to the public, through public perception surveys conducted by professional and independent agencies.

Such surveys are globally tested tools for improving service delivery in policing and enhancing public satisfaction. With the above aim and to further strengthen the good governance practices in the working of police, the Home Ministry has commissioned the Bureau of Police Research and Development to conduct this pan-India survey called the 'All India Citizens Survey of Police Services, another official said.

The survey will be conducted through the National Council of Applied Economic Research in New Delhi.

The states and the UTs have been requested to extend full cooperation to the conduct of the survey, and to adopt this good practice and prepare their police for undertaking such surveys on their own in the future, the official said.



"We all want to sleep with unity, walk with unity, talk with unity... we want a united India, a powerful India," Banerjee said.

Meanwhile, ruling Trinamool Congress sources said the Bengal Chief Minister would next week attend the anti-BJP opposition meet scheduled to be held at Mohali in Punjab.

The meeting is likely to be held on February 26. A senior TMC leader said "the Chief Minister will take part in the all-party meeting at Mohali as she has been a prime mover for an opposition unity to throw the BJP out of power."

Banerjee had earlier attended a similar meeting at NCP chief Sharad Pawar's residence in Delhi where she met most opposition leaders including Congress president Rahul Gandhi.

IED recovered from Govt bus in Maharashtra

Security beefed at bus depots, stands, checks ordered in buses

An improvised explosive device (IED) was recovered from a State Transport bus in Maharashtra's Raigad district late on Wednesday night.

The ST bus was on its way from Karjat to Apta village near Panvel town when the driver found a suspected material kept in a bag on board the bus, at around 11 pm.

The circumspect ST bus driver quickly acted and asked the passengers to disembark the bus. He also immediately alerted the police about the finding.

A team of Bomb Detection and Disposal Squad from the nearby Alibaug rushed to the spot short afterwards. The team found that the material looking a device kept in a bag was indeed an IED. "The team took nearly five hours

to defuse the IED by removing the wires and detonator in it. The police sanitised the ST bus in the early hours of today," a senior police officer said.

Raigad's district superintendent of police Anil Paraskar said that device had been sent for forensic examination. "We have a reason to believe the device might have been kept to create a panic and terror among people," Paraskar said.

After the incident, the coastal Raigad district was placed under a high alert. The State-run Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation (MSRTC) ordered beefing up of security across its depots, bus stands and buses in the state.

Maharashtra's Transport minister Diwakar Raote ordered a check of all the buses in its fleet. "This is serious and the matter is being investigated," he said.

Meanwhile, initial investigations have revealed the IED device was of relatively a low intensity explosive.

Ex-Visva Bharati V-C, Registrar get five-year RI for forgery

In a rare judgment a Birbhum court on Thursday sentenced former Vice Chancellor, Registrar and a professor of the prestigious Visva Bharati University to five years' rigorous imprisonment after they were found guilty of forgery by the same court.

Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Arvind Mishra on Thursday sentenced ex VC and mathematician Dilip Kumar Sinha, Registrar Dilip Kumar Mukherjee and Mutki Deb a former professor to 5 years' RI after they were found guilty under various sections of Forgery Act, and Sections 467, 468, 471, 475 and 120B (criminal conspiracy) of the Indian Penal Code.

A prosecution lawyer said that Deb had forged her testimonials and joined the University as a lecturer in mathematics despite being an undergraduate. Photostat copies of her forged mark sheets and certificates were allegedly stamped and attested by Dr Sinha who functioned as the VC of the said central University from 1995 to 2001.

Visva Bharati was founded by Poet Laureate Rabindranath Tagore and is considered a centre of excellence throughout the world.

It was alleged that Sinha had impersonated as one

Rashbehari Ghosh a professor in the University of Calcutta. As a result Deb's forged testimonials established her as a B.Sc, M.Sc and M.Phil pass outs from CU, Jadavpur University and Visva Bharati University respectively. The Registrar was found guilty for neglecting his duty by cross-checking the testimonials.

A case was registered after Deb applied for enrolment in Ph.D course in 2002. When she was asked to produce her original certificates she withdrew her application saying they had been stolen and even placed a police diary in favour of her claims.

After the authorities conducted a probe all the three were found guilty and an FIR was registered with the Bolpur Police Station.

Meanwhile, the advocate of the convicts said his client would prefer an appeal in the higher courts even as the trio was taken into jail custody.

Govt empowers Assam Rifles to arrest, search sans warrant

Assam Rifles personnel have been empowered by the Central Government to arrest anyone and search a place without warrant in northeastern States of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland and Mizoram.

According to a Home Ministry notification, "an officer of the rank corresponding to that of the lowest rank of members of the Assam Rifles" has been given these powers under the Code of Criminal Procedure.

Assam Rifles personnel will exercise these powers and discharge their duties "under sub-section(1) of section 41, sections 47, 48, 49, 51, 53, 54, 149, 150, 151 and 152 of the

CrPC within the local limits of the area comprised within the border districts of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland and Mizoram."

Section 41 of the CrPC states that any police officer may, without an order from a magistrate and without a warrant, arrest any person. Section 47 gives powers for search of place entered by person sought to be arrested.

Section 48 says a police officer may, for the purpose of arresting without warrant any person whom he is authorised to arrest, pursue such person into any place in India. According to Section 49, the person arrested shall not be subjected to more restraint than is necessary to prevent his escape.

Niti: Govt reforms made India fastest economy

India's growth in the current fiscal year is estimated to be 7.2 per cent

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

The host of reforms undertaken by the Government has transformed India into the fastest-growing major economy along with the macroeconomic stability not witnessed in the past, according to a note prepared by the Niti Aayog.

The country's growth, the note added, has decisively increased over the last five years and is much higher than the average growth among the emerging and developing economies.

"India's economic performance dipped considerably during 2010-13.

"Over the last five years (2014-18), the India economy has recovered and now is going through one of its best-ever phases of economic growth combined with the microeco-



conomic stability," the note said. Narendra Modi became the prime minister in May 2014 after the Bharatiya Janata Party-led National Democratic Alliance won the general elections.

The next general elections are due in April-May.

According to the note, in 2018-19, against India's likely growth of 7.2 per cent, the world GDP growth would be 3.7 per cent and median of seven emerging market economies (Brazil, China, Indonesia, Philippines, Russia, South Africa and Turkey) is 3.5 per cent.

The closest to India is

China, which is estimated to grow at 6.6 per cent in 2018-19, the note said.

"The uptick in economic growth has come from various economic reforms undertaken by the Government such as improvement in ease of doing business, opening up to foreign direct investments, the push for infrastructure development and a stable and decisive policy environment," it added.

India's growth in the current fiscal year is estimated to be 7.2 per cent with the growth in preceding three years being 8 per cent, 8.2 per cent and 7.2 per cent.

Public sector banks zoom up to 19% on fund infusion plan

Shares of public sector banks (PSBs) jumped up to 19 per cent on Thursday after the Finance Ministry announced infusion of ₹48,239 crore in 12 such lenders in this fiscal to help them maintain regulatory capital requirements and finance growth plans.

Corporation Bank zoomed 19.02 per cent at close of trade, UCO Bank 8.75 per cent, Indian Overseas Bank 6.78 per cent, Central Bank of India 5.50 per cent on BSE.

Shares of Allahabad Bank jumped 5.34 per cent, Andhra Bank 5.22 per cent, Bank of Maharashtra 3.96 per cent, Syndicate Bank 3.59 per cent, Punjab National Bank 2.95 per cent, Union Bank of India 2.80 per cent and Bank of India 1.83 per cent.

"Market extended gains as investors sentiment has been boosted owing to recapitalisation of PSU banks," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services.

With this funding, the total amount of capital infusion would increase to ₹1,00,958



crore of the planned recapitalisation of ₹1.06 lakh crore for PSBs for the current fiscal, according to Financial Services Secretary Rajiv Kumar.

Corporation Bank is the biggest beneficiary of this round of capital infusion with ₹9,086 crore of funding, followed by Allahabad Bank with ₹6,896 crore.

Further, ₹4,638 crore and ₹205 crore will be provided to Bank of India and Bank of Maharashtra, respectively.

Punjab National Bank will get ₹5,908 crore, Union Bank of India ₹4,112 crore, Andhra Bank ₹3,256 crore and Syndicate Bank ₹1,603 crore.

Under prompt corrective action (PCA), the Government will pump in ₹12,535 crore in four other banks — Central Bank of India, United Bank, UCO Bank and Indian Overseas Bank.

₹ drops 13 paise to 71.24 against \$ as crude rises

The rupee skidded by 11 paise to close at 71.24 against the US dollar on Thursday as rising oil prices and a strengthening greenback weighed on the market sentiment.

At the Interbank Foreign Exchange (forex) market, the domestic unit opened strong at 71.06 and rose to 70.91. However, it could not hold on to the gains and fell to a low of 71.29 before finally ending at 71.24 — a fall of 13 paise.

The rupee had closed at 71.11 against the US dollar Wednesday. Foreign institutional investors (FIIs), who had been heavy sellers over the past few sessions, net bought equities worth ₹55 crore Thursday while domestic institutional investors bought shares to the tune of ₹202 crore, provisional data showed.

Global markets were mixed following the release of Federal Reserve minutes which showed that the US central bank would be patient on interest rate hikes.

The dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.13 per cent to 96.57.

BHEL commissions 250 MW thermal power plant in Bihar

Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL) has successfully commissioned a 250 MW coal-based thermal power plant (TPP) in Bihar.

The unit has been commissioned at the greenfield 4x250 MW Nabinagar Thermal Power Project, being set up by Bharatiya Rail Bijlee Company Limited (BRBCL), a joint venture of NTPC Limited and the Indian Railways.

This is the third 250 MW unit commissioned by BHEL at Nabinagar TPP, located at Nabinagar in Aurangabad district of Bihar. The first two units are already under commercial operation and the fourth unit is in an advanced stage of execution.

The orders for Steam

Generator (SG) and Turbine Generator (TG) packages for setting up of four units of 250 MW coal based thermal plant were placed on BHEL. The company's scope of work encompassed design, engineering, manufacture, supply, erection and commissioning of Steam Turbines, Generators and Boilers, along with associated Auxiliaries and Electricals, besides state-of-the-art Controls & Instrumentation (C&I) and Electrostatic Precipitators (ESPs).

The key equipment for the project has been manufactured by BHEL at its Haridwar, Trichy, Ranipet, Hyderabad and Bengaluru works, while the construction of the plant has been undertaken by the company's Power Sector — Eastern Region.



PAKISTAN PM TO MILITARY

Respond decisively to any aggression by India

PTI ■ ISLAMABAD

Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan on Thursday authorised the military to "respond decisively and comprehensively to any aggression or misadventure" by India, amidst heightened tensions between the two sides following the Pulwama terror attack that killed 40 CRPF soldiers.

Days after the terror strike by Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammad terror group in Jammu and Kashmir's Pulwama district, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said security forces have been given free hand to avenge the dastardly act.

Prime Minister Khan, who chaired a key meeting of the National Security Council here on Thursday, said the Pakistan government was "determined to demonstrate" that it is capable of protecting its people.

He authorised the armed forces of Pakistan to "respond decisively and comprehensively to any aggression or misadventure by India," said a statement issued after the meeting.

"This is a new Pakistan and we are determined to demonstrate to our people that the State is capable of protecting them," Khan was quoted as saying by the Radio Pakistan.

The country's top civilian

and military leadership said that "Pakistan is not involved in any way, means or form in Pulwama incident and it was conceived, planned and executed indigenously", according to the statement.

It said Pakistan has sincerely offered investigation of the "incident" and dialogue on the issue of terrorism among other disputed issues with India.

"We expect India to positively respond to these offers," it said, adding that based on investigation or any tangible evidence provided, Pakistan shall take action against anyone found using its soil.

The NSC urged the global community to play its part in resolving the Kashmir issue.

In a video message on Tuesday, Khan assured India that he would act against the perpetrators of the Pulwama terror attack if New Delhi

shares "actionable intelligence", but warned against any "revenge" retaliatory action.

India rubbished Khan's comments, saying disclaiming Pakistan's link with terrorist attacks is an oft-repeated excuse by the "nerve centre" of terrorism.

In a statement, the Ministry of External Affairs in New Delhi on Tuesday said India was not surprised that Khan refused to acknowledge the attack on India's security forces in Pulwama as an act of terrorism, adding his offer to investigate the attack if provided proof is a "lame excuse".

Ahead of the NSC meeting on Thursday, Prime Minister Khan and Army chief Gen Qamar Javed Bajwa held a one-on-one meeting during which they discussed region's security situation.

The meeting was attended by Army chief General Bajwa, services chiefs, heads of intelligence agencies, security officials and federal and state ministers for finance, defence, foreign affairs and interior.

Khan also directed both the interior ministry and the security institutions to immediately accelerate actions on ground to ensure that militancy and extremism are routed from the society and the country.

70 killed as massive fire rages through historic part in B'desh

A fast-moving fire swept through adjoining apartment buildings and chemical warehouses in a historic part of the Bangladesh capital Dhaka, killing at least 70 people and injuring several others, the latest such deadly blaze in the country.

Officials said the fire broke out at night a chemical warehouse on the ground floor of a four-storey building named Hazi Wahed Mansion behind a mosque in Old Dhaka's congested Chawkbazar area on Wednesday night and the flames then quickly spread through four other buildings nearby, including a community centre where a wedding

party was on. "The salvage campaign is ending here," mayor of Dhaka South Sayeed Khokon said. Fire officials said that the

blaze has claimed at least 70 lives so far.

Earlier, fire service control room spokesman Kamrul Ahsan said that the death toll

was 81. However, it was later revised downward to at least 70. Dhaka Metropolitan Police officials said the fire spread rapidly due to the multiple chemical godowns that were situated in the area.

State-run Dhaka Medical College Hospital's director Brigadier General AKM Nasiruddin, however, feared that the toll may rise as several people were being treated at the facility with critical burn injuries.

Khokon called off the rescue operation around 12:10 PM after nearly 14 hours of efforts. Two-hundred fire-fighters from 37 units doused the blaze, making their way to the scene through narrow lanes with fire engines.

11 WOUNDED IN CENTRAL CHINA KNIFE ATTACK

Beijing: A man with a history of mental illness wounded 11 people with a knife after attacking random pedestrians in central China, local authorities said Thursday. The suspect, a 33-year-old man named Guo Kaibin, is already in police custody, according to a social media notice posted by police in Ji'an, a city in central Jiangxi province.

Pelosi urges support for resolution to block border wall emergency

House Speaker Nancy Pelosi on Wednesday called upon lawmakers to back a resolution to halt the national emergency declared by US President Donald Trump to fund a wall on the southern border with Mexico.

Mahatma Gandhi's lifestyle did not leave any carbon footprint, a lesson for world: Modi

Mahatma Gandhi's lifestyle was a crucial lesson for the world facing the daunting challenge of global warming and climate change as he lived such a life that he did not leave any carbon footprint, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said Thursday.

Unveiling a bust of Mahatma Gandhi at the prestigious Yonsei University here along with South Korean President Moon Jae-in and former UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, Modi said in the 20th Century, Mahatma Gandhi was "perhaps the mankind's biggest gift".

"In the last century through his personality, through his life and values, Mahatma Gandhi showed us what the future will be. In fact he used to say my life is my lesson," said the prime minister, who arrived here on Thursday on two-day visit.

"Mahatma Gandhi used to say the God and nature have given everything to fulfil a human being's need but not the greed. The natural resources are not enough if we want to satisfy our greed. He used to say our life should be need based and not greed based," Modi said.

He said that terrorism and climate change are two biggest

challenges mankind is facing and Mahatma Gandhi's teachings and values can help the world address both the pressing issues.

"During Mahatma Gandhi's lifetime there was no discussion about climate change and environment, but the statesman led such a life that he did not leave any carbon footprint. He showed what living in harmony with nature is. He showed that it is important to leave a clean and green planet for the future generations." Gandhi used to say we don't have the right to take away the natural resources that belong to the future generations.

Russia indicts US investor for fraud: Lawyer

AFF ■ MOSCOW

Russian investigators formally charged US investor **Michael Calvey** with fraud on Thursday following his controversial arrest, his lawyer said. Investigators presented him

with the indictment on the charge of large-scale fraud as part of an organised group, which can carry up to ten years in prison.

"He has refused to admit his guilt or give any testimony" before consulting with his defense, lawyer **Dmitry Kletochkin** told Russian news agencies.

Calvey is the founder of the multi-billion-dollar **Baring Vostok** investment fund. He is one of six people arrested in a probe into the alleged embezzlement of 2.5 billion rubles (USD 37.7 million) from the Russian **Vostochny Bank**.

Calvey has said in court that the charges against him are being used as an instrument in a shareholder dispute, insisting that he has done nothing wrong.

Several high-profile figures have spoken on behalf of Calvey, with Russia's business ombudsman **Boris Titov** saying the case was a typical corporate dispute and calling his arrest illegal. But Kremlin spokesman **Dmitry Peskov** on Thursday said: "We have no doubt that truth will prevail as a result of the investigation. Nobody but the court can pronounce **Michael Calvey** innocent."

Gimenez and Godin strike late to earn Atletico 2-0 victory in an entertaining first leg tie against Juventus

AFP ■ MADRID

Cristiano Ronaldo's Champions League mission with Juventus stalled on Wednesday as Atletico Madrid secured a deserved 2-0 victory from a thrilling first leg at the Wanda Metropolitano.

Ronaldo returned to the Spanish capital, where he enjoyed unprecedented success in this tournament with Real, but it was their rivals celebrating at the final whistle as goals from Jose Gimenez and Diego Godin put Atletico within sight of the quarter-finals.

But this was a victory that Simeone's side fully deserved. Antoine Griezmann had hit the crossbar while VAR twice intervened, correctly, in Juve's favour, cancelling a penalty for a foul on Diego Costa and then ruling out an Alvaro Morata header just before Gimenez struck.

While Juventus tried to preserve the stalemate, Atletico were bold. Simeone introduced Morata, Thomas Lemar and Angel Correa, all around the hour-mark, and his daring paid off. "I showed balls," Simeone said.

Juve are certainly not dead and buried, particularly given Costa and Thomas Parthey will both be suspended for the return in Turin after each picked up yellow cards.

But the failure to score an away goal, and their clear inferiority in the second half does not bode well for any hopes of a comeback.

"They don't give you chances," said Allegri. "They make you play badly."

Defeat in the last 16 for either team would be unthinkable, for Atletico, who know the final will be played here, at their own stadium, on June 1, the perfect chance to wrestle the trophy off Real in the very city they share.

RONALDO SUBDUED

And for Juventus, whose wait for Europe's premier prize has now entered its 23rd year, when expectations are higher than ever given they now boast the tournament's most prolific ever player.

Ronaldo, though, endured a disappointing night, suffocated from the outset by a typically relentless Atletico backline.

Perhaps it was frustration that made him wave five fingers in the direction of the baiting Atletico crowd, presumably to signify his five Champions League triumphs.

Sterling winner caps late City comeback

Raheem Sterling sealed a dramatic 3-2 Champions League win for 10-man Manchester City at Schalke on Wednesday as the English champions scored twice in the last five minutes.

Sterling tucked away the winner at the Veltins Arena in the 90th minute just after substitute Leroy Sane fired home a stunning free-kick for the Premier League leaders against his former club in the last 16, first leg.

Schalke led 2-1 at half-time as the VAR twice intervened to award penalties, both converted by Nabil Bentaleb, cancelling out Sergio Aguero's opener in Gelsenkirchen.

City were in real trouble with 22 minutes left when Nicolas Otamendi, who gave away the controversial first penalty, was sent off for a second yellow card before Sane's moment of brilliance and Sterling's winner.

However, City still have some work to do in the return leg on March 12 with Ferdinandinho, who was booked when conceding the second spot-kick, and Otamendi both suspended.

Schalke are just above the Bundesliga's relegation places and winless in their last four league games, yet they gave Premier League leaders City an almighty struggle.

The hosts initially struggled to get out of their half as Man City dominated the opening 30 minutes, until the game swung dramatically Schalke's way with the two penalty decisions.

Schalke shot themselves in the foot for City's opening goal on 18 minutes when a lazy pass from goalkeeper Ralf Faehrmann to Salif Sane was snapped up by David Silva.

The Spaniard drew Faehrmann and selflessly served up a simple tap-in for Aguero to claim his 10th goal in his last seven City appearances.

SCHALKE SPARKED INTO LIFE However, falling behind sparked life into Schalke.

Schalke drew level after Daniel Caligiuri fired in a speculative shot which clipped Otamendi's arm.

Despite City's furious protests, the spot-kick was duly awarded, which Bentaleb tucked away to the delight of the home crowd on 38 min-

Bentaleb stepped up to smash the spot-kick past Ederson and put Schalke ahead.

The second half was a much more even affair with Schalke no longer intimidated to be playing star-studded City.

In turn, the visitors' problems were compounded on 68 minutes when Otamendi clattered Schalke's replacement forward Guido Burgstaller and was dismissed.

In a bid to turn the match with 13 minutes left, Leroy Sane came on for Aguero and the Germany international produced the goals against the club he left in 2016. Then Sterling latched onto goalkeeper Ederson's long clearance as the home defence hesitated and slotted in.

Then, it was Griezmann's turn, this time Szczesny intervening, tipping the Frenchman's lob onto the crossbar before Giorgio Chiellini stopped Costa from reaching the rebound.

Atletico were pushing and it was Morata, on for Costa, who made the difference. He powered in a brilliant header only to see it chalked off for a push but he was not deterred, and when Juve failed to clear his knock-down at a corner, Gimenez was perfectly placed.

Juve were rattled and their failure to rally could cost them dear. Atletico scored again as Godin rose to head in at the near post, only to turn and find Mario Mandzukic had cleared the ball to his feet. The angle was tight but the net was open.

Juve might have snatched an away goal late on but Oblak pushed over Federico Bernardeschi's shot. They have it all to do.

Di Maria hits screamer as PSG cruise

Angel Di Maria scored a sumptuous free-kick and Kylian Mbappe was also on target as Paris Saint-Germain continued their relentless march towards another French title by hammering Montpellier 5-1 on Wednesday.

With Neymar and Edinson Cavani still absent, Layvin Kurzawa also scored for PSG at the Parc des Princes, while two own goals completed the rout.

Florent Mollet had equalised at one point in the first half for the visitors before they crumbled in a rearranged fixture that had initially been postponed in early December due to disruption caused by "yellow vest" anti-government protests in France.

As they warm up for the second leg of their Champions League last-16 tie



against Manchester United on March 6, PSG are now a huge 15 points clear of second-placed Lille, and still have a game in hand as they race to a sixth Ligue 1 title in seven seasons.

"It was not our best performance, but with our attacking quality it was a deserved victory," said PSG coach Thomas Tuchel after his side maintained their per-

fect home record in the league this season.

It was also their ninth win by a margin of at least four goals in the current campaign.

He was missing a host of players for this game, with skipper Thiago Silva suspended. French international left-back Kurzawa was making his first start in the league in an injury-hit season and he opened the scoring in the 13th minute with a header from a Daniel Alves cross.

Montpellier remain sixth, while PSG now host mid-table Nimes on Saturday before a French Cup quarter-final against Dijon and then a visit to Caen, as their busy schedule continues before the visit of United.

The other game in France on Wednesday saw bottom side Guingamp draw 0-0 at Bordeaux.

TSITSIPAS BACK TO WINNING WAYS

MARSEILLE: Rising Greek star Stefanos Tsitsipas bounced back from successive defeats with a comfortable win over Poland's Hubert Hurkacz to reach the quarter-finals in Marseille on Wednesday. The 20-year-old, who stunned Roger Federer en route to the Australian Open semi-finals last month, had lost his last two matches to Gael Monfils and Damiir Dzumhur. But Tsitsipas, the top seed this week in France, was back in form as he brushed aside world number 78 Hurkacz 6-4, 6-2 in only an hour. He will next face a lucky loser — either Ukrainian world number 141 Sergiy Stakhovsky or the 130th-ranked Gregoire Barrere — in the last eight.

BREAKDANCING SET FOR OLYMPICS DEBUT

PARIS: Breakdancing is set to make its debut as an Olympic sport at Paris 2024, the head of the local organising committee said on Thursday. Skateboarding, sport climbing and surfing, which have already been added to the programme for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, have been invited to return in Paris four years later. Tony Estanguet, the head of the Paris 2024 organising committee and a former Olympic Gold medalist in canoeing, said the inclusion of the four sports responded to a need to make the Olympics "more urban" and "more artistic". "This is a major step forward in our ambition to organise a unique Olympic Games," Estanguet said.

SAXENA'S 122 PUTS INDIAN COLTS IN COMMAND

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: A brilliant knock of 122 by left-handed opener Divyansh Saxena put India under-19 team in a command position against South Africa on the second day of the first 'Youth' Test on Thursday. The home team made 330 all out in 92.3 overs in reply to South Africa's 197 and prised out three wickets to gain the upperhand at stumps. The visitors closed the day's play at 34 for 3 in 15 overs having lost the openers and captain Matthew Montgomery. Saxena got better as the innings progressed as he hit some delightful shots and hammered a six. To South Africa's credit, they didn't allow the Rahul Dravid-coached India under-19s to run away with things as the bowlers struck at regular intervals to dismiss the host for 330 and limit the lead to 133.

TENDULKAR TO DO PUSHUPS AT IDBI MARATHON

NEW DELHI: Cricket icon Sachin Tendulkar will join thousands of runners during the IDBI Federal Life Insurance New Delhi Marathon on Sunday to raise funds for the families of the martyrs of the Pulwama terror attack. Before the start of each of the four races at the Jawaharal Nehru Stadium on Sunday, Tendulkar will do 5-10 push-ups as part of the #KeepMoving Push-up Challenge and the runners will join him in the exercise. For each of the participants in the challenge, IDBI Federal, the marathon organisers, will donate ₹100 towards the fund for the martyrs' families. More than 18,000 runners are expected to take part in the four races — full marathon (2000), half marathon (6000), timed 10K (5500) and 5K Swachh Bharat Run (4500)—of the New Delhi Marathon.

SEVILLA BEAT LAZIO TO REACH EUROPA LAST 16

SEVILLE: Wissam Ben Yedder scored his second goal of the tie as Sevilla eased to a 2-0 second-leg win over Lazio to reach the Europa League last 16. The record five-time winners had claimed a 1-0 first-leg victory in Rome last week thanks to a Ben Yedder strike, and the Frenchman doubled their overall lead on 20 minutes by tapping in after Pablo Sarabia's shot was saved by Thomas Strakosha. Sarabia wrapped up a 3-0 aggregate success by lashing home Jesus Navas' pass with 12 minutes to play.

VOLLEYBALL OFF TO FLYING START

MUSBA HASHMI speaks with some of the prominent Volleyball players who shares their journey and experiences with the game

As the inaugural season of Pro Volleyball League has started all the players have geared up themselves to win the season. Every team is trying to give its best to make the season an exciting and thrilling contest. Hailing from a sports background, SAQLAIN TARIQ has been playing volleyball since his childhood. Tariq currently plays for U Mumba Volley. Tariq's inspiration has been his father who was also his coach. "I come from a sporting background. My father is a former Volleyball player, and is currently coaching Volleyball. My elder brother is a Volleyball player and he is also coaching. So my entire family has been associated with Volleyball and therefore I developed interest in the game. My father has been my source of inspiration from the beginning," he tells you.

Talking about the strategies that he uses during play, Tariq said: "It takes time to develop on the skills as instructed by a coach. My position is of a setter, and it is the setter's responsibility to decide on the number of balls a player gets in the team, which is essential to function as a team. It is a very deliverable position, where your contribution decides on how much you receive, and I've become habitual of it," he says.

There are so many legends I looked up to growing up, and the opportunity to have them as teammates and learn from them was an amazing time in my volleyball career," he tells you adding that his success mantra is to never let your position decide who you are just be focused in your game and remain what you are.

Clark has a piece of advice for the aspiring players. "Listen, ask questions, and be open to critique. There's nothing better than a young player, who is eager to learn and is down to earth. I have more respect for humble athletes, who just want to get better and keep improving," he says.

Shyness becomes obstacle

Many a times, it happens that despite being knowledgeable we get stuck while proving our efficiency due to shyness but, it may cause a big hurdle if we don't get rid of it at early age, says TEAM VIVA

Those who have never suffered from shyness have no idea how debilitating it can be, especially for someone in a professional situation. If shyness is holding you back, learn how to get past it and become more confident.

Shyness can truly hold people back--partly because those who are shy tend to avoid public situations and speaking up, and partly because they experience so much chronic anxiety.

If that's you, take comfort in knowing you are far from alone--four out of 10 people consider themselves shy.

But here's the good news: Shyness can be overcome. With time and effort and a desire to change, it's possible to break through.

If your shyness is severe, you may need help from a therapist or counselor, but most people can overcome it on their own.

Shyness doesn't necessarily equate to being introverted or not liking yourself. It simply means that for some reason you get embarrassed when the spotlight hits you. What's the root of your shyness? It's generally the symptom of a larger problem.

One of the first steps to overcome your shyness is try to accept

your shyness and be comfortable with it. The more you will resist it unconsciously or consciously, longer it will prevail. If you are shy then accept it and embrace it totally. One way it could be done is by saying to yourself repeatedly 'Yes I am shy and I accept it'.

Shyness is maintained through a vicious cycle in which people approach a social situation, feel the excessive fear of negative evaluation, and then avoid the situation which initially provides relief; however, this often leads to feelings of shame and self-blame. In order to cope with these feelings, our negative emotions can turn into anger and blame toward others, and so others can be viewed as inconsiderate or unsupportive, which further reinforces the desire to avoid them.

Interacting with other people makes most, if not all of us uncomfortable. Even the most gregarious and self-confident people remain aware of and influenced by the opinions of others--and specifically the opinions others have about them. Even if we tell ourselves such opinions don't matter to us, if everyone in our community turned suddenly against us at once, even the most hardy of us would have a difficult time remaining unaffected.

When in the company of other



people, our minds automatically construct a map of the minds that surround us. That is, we're constantly imagining and theorizing what other people are thinking--and making judgments about and having reactions to those imaginings. If we think someone in the room finds us attractive, we judge them to have good taste and feel a buzz of pleasure (or perhaps, if we suffer from low self-esteem, we judge them to have bad taste and feel an increased sense of self-disgust). If we think

someone in the room finds us overdressed for the occasion, we'll feel embarrassed.

Make a list of all your positive qualities--enlist a friend or family member to help if you need to--and read or recite it when you're feeling insecure. Let it remind you how much you have to offer.

Shy people tend to have fewer but deeper friendships--which means your choice of friend or partner is even more important. Give your time to the people in your life

who are responsive, warm, and encouraging.

There are always a few people who are willing to be cruel or sarcastic if it makes for a good punch line, some who just have no sense of what's appropriate, and some who don't care whom they hurt. Keep a healthy distance from these people.

Most of us are hardest on ourselves, so make a habit of observing others (without making a big deal out of it). You may find that other people are suffering from their own

symptoms of insecurity and that you are not alone.

Especially when you spend a lot of time inside your own head, as shy people tend to do, it's easy to distort experiences, to think that your shyness ruined an entire event--when chances are it wasn't a big deal to anyone but you.

PURSUIT OF BALANCE

Actor **ANIL KAPOOR**, who will be seen next in *Total Dhamaal*, tells **SAIMI SATTAR** that all genres need a good script

Actor Anil Kapoor Kapoor is conversing with the chef and asks him to send some *meethi chutney* to accompany the really delicious *Delhi samosas*. Eating fried, oily snacks is quite contrary to the idea of the actor's diet, who seems to have drunk from the fountain of eternal youth, but he lets us in on his mantra. "The body is like a bank balance. It needs a certain number of calories to run. If you've burnt more calories and eaten less, then you have the bank balance which can be withdrawn when it is needed. Today is one such day when it is okay to indulge myself," says the actor, who, except the fine lines and creases here and there, looks not a day older to when he had made his debut in 1979.

Dressed in all black, he is promoting his new film *Total Dhamaal*, where he reunites with Madhuri Dixit, his popular co-star of the 90s. "It has been a long career. I have been quite lucky. And there is the bonus of being able to work with beautiful girls like Madhuri," he guffaws.

As to what kept him invested in the adventure comedy film, he tells us, "First of all, I laughed reading the script. That did it for me. This is an ensemble cast and the biggest advantage is that the entire film is not on your shoulder, which reduces the pressure. As a result, we enjoyed acting in the film more and did better. This is also apparent in the trailer and people are liking it," he says. And the subject of mature romance worked well for him and Madhuri. "When you are younger, you can take the pressure because you are fresh, the songs are great and as a pair you are also looking good together. We are not Ranveer Singh and Alia Bhatt. We should stay in our *auqat*."

Of course, he points out that there are other factors that prove to be clingers. "The script, director, co-stars, producers, distributors and the money make me decide," says the 62-year-old. But whichever genre he is working in, preparation is essential. "In today's time when the stakes are so high, every detail including performance, dialect design, art and clothes have to be prepared in advance. If you are prepared, your work will be faster, easier and better."

Having worked in comedy franchises quite a bit, Kapoor believes that the foremost role is played by the writers. "Only a few people can work on punches and understand them in a manner that it works pan-India, with people from villages to those in the cities, students, children, intellectuals. The dialogues should make everyone or at least 70 per cent of the population laugh. These days there is a surfeit of comedy for various categories of audience, be it TV, YouTube and even stand-up acts. So in a film, you need to add scale and adventure. We have got in an animal farm like scenario in *Total Dhamaal*, which is not possible in a TV show, for instance, to make sure that people feel that they've got their money's worth," he says.

Kapoor feels there are as many styles of comedy as there are directors, writers and actors. "*Chameli ki Shaadi* was situational. Indra Kumar does a combination of situational, gags and physical comedy. Similarly, Priyadarshan is different and so is Rohit Shetty or the old guard like Basu Chatterjee and Hrishikesh. Directors need to have a sense of humour inherently and that makes a difference. Their thinking, the way of writing and the editing can make a comedy work or fall flat. The physical comedy that Jim Carey does was fantastic. The way Ben Stiller works is different.

Steve Martin, Mehmood, Kishore Kumar traverse similar territory. Amitiji is more poker and physical while Govinda and Johnny Lever have their own street-smart way of executing it. Coming to the writers, the kind of comedy that was penned by Kader Khan was distinct."

Kapoor is categorical that if the writing is flat, then even a Charlie Chaplin or Laurel Hardy cannot make a script work. "Gags have to be well-written and thought out. When the writing is good, it is easier for the actors," he says and goes on to give the example of American show *Modern Family* as brilliantly written.

We rely on his experience to talk about the progression of content in cinema and inevitably talk revolves around *Ek Ladki Ko Dekha Toh Aisa Laga*. "The audience is evolving. The educated, sensible youth of the country are exposed through the internet and are engaging with sensible content." And he loves the next generation. While most actors do not like carrying work back home or vice versa even when they have spouses or parents from the industry, Kapoor has no qualms admitting that shooting with his daughter Sonam was a blast.

"During the shooting of *Ek Ladki Ko Dekha Toh Aisa Laga*, we were preparing for marriage and in between shots we discussed everything related to it," he says of the film.

which she suggested to him. Even earlier, while choosing his international outing *Slumdog Millionaire*, it was his son Harshvardhan, who pushed him. As for his much-acclaimed TV series *24*, he went with his wife Sunita's gut feel. "When we started *24* about seven to eight years ago, I had trouble explaining to people that there can be a season and a daily soap is not necessary. I had to convince the producers that we could pitch it well for TV and if the casting was good with mainstream actors like me, then people would accept quality content on Indian TV. I wanted a certain amount of money because I knew I couldn't make it in a lesser amount," he recalls as he keeps his fingers crossed for a third season of the show.

The fast-paced show won a lot of fan following. "Some people even said it should be slowed down because it was so edge-of-the-seat," he says. But there are other problems too while shooting in the series format as opposed to a film. "There are 24 episodes which represent an hour in one day. While the films are for two hours, the content that we needed for each episode is 40 minutes which adds up to 20 hours for the entire season. That means 10 films in a year! It was strenuous and a roller coaster ride. Sometimes we even worked for 18 hours."

Besides the content, another way that Kapoor has seen the industry change is the way it treats women. He believes that #MeToo has changed the work environment. However, he believes, "I was fortunate to work in films where there was a healthy atmosphere. Whether it was my Telugu debut as Bapu in *Vamsa Vruksham* (1980) or with MS Sathyu with whom I was a part of *Kahan Kahan Se Guzar Gaye*, our assistants and newcomers were women. In *Parinda*, Renu Saluja was the editor and she controlled everything. Much later in *Ayesha*, Rhea was the producer and she was 21. On the sets of *Veere di Wedding*, I had to look for a boy as there were 50 girls. In this film, the photographer is a Japanese girl. We are consciously creating an atmosphere."

A Civic lesson

The new tenth-generation Honda Civic is certainly an attractive vehicle, with or without its front-end. But will it set the roads alight as the previous Civic did in India?

When Honda Cars India launched the first Civic here a decade and a half ago, it heralded a revolution. The car, which was the eighth-generation of the Japanese carmaker's popular sedan (and hatchback in European countries), was a sales success. But Honda was not able to continue the Civic's successful run in India for too long for a multitude of reasons. However, one has to admit that a major reason why sales of the Civic tailed off was India's growing love affair with oil-burners, that is diesel cars. Honda globally did not have a smaller diesel motor that they could bring to India back then and that played a role in the company ceding the segment to its rivals, first the Chevrolet Cruze and then further on the Toyota Corolla Altis and Skoda Octavia.

But now the Honda Civic is back and after skipping one global generation, Honda cars India has brought in the tenth-generation. This time, they have ensured that it has a diesel engine alongside a zippy petrol motor. So let us deal with the headline numbers first. The 1.6 litre turbocharged diesel engine, which shares duty on the other recently introduced Honda, the CR-V, produces a decent 120 horsepower. The company claims that thanks to their "Earth Dreams" technology, the Civic i-DTEC returns an astounding 26 km per litre under Indian test conditions. The Civic also comes with a 1.8 litre i-VTEC petrol that produces a fairly decent 140 horsepower. Disappointingly for Civic fans, Honda has not brought either of the powerful engines that do service on this particular sedan in the United States, which are a 158 horsepower 2.0 i-VTEC and the very impressive 200 horsepower turbocharged 1.5 litre engine. Of course, India is a fuel-economy obsessed market but Honda has bucked the trend in the past with cars like the Honda Accord V6, which all car nuts in India who drove, including myself, remember as a rocket, a thirsty rocket, but a rocket nonetheless. Even today, good second-hand examples of this car, like the original Honda City VTEC, which was another amazing car, command top dollar.

But can the new Honda Civic become a future classic like its illustrious predecessors? Well, it does certainly knock the door on the looks front. Yes, the snout of the car is a bit incongruous. In fact, the chrome slab across the front grille, which is apparently a Honda signature, does make the car look quite weird. Because from the side and particularly from the rear, it looks fabulous. In fact, the rear three-quarter look of this vehicle is among the prettiest I have seen on a car in India. This car looks as attractive as a supermodel sashaying down the ramp with some toilet paper stuck to her heel. Still very, very pretty but you know, something is off.


What I did find interesting is that despite the looks, particularly the coupe-shaped sloping roofline which makes you assume that the car would be very tight inside, it really is not. I will not say it is the most spacious car in its segment but it does not feel cramped. After all, the Civic sedan is designed for the American market, where people are not quite small or short. Headroom in the front is not bad at all, and I am 5'11". In the rear, even with the front seats pushed back, space is more than sufficient for myself and while three adults on the rear bench is a squeeze on any car, it will not feel so bad on the Civic. The only issue is possibly the fact that in order to get the space in the front and rear, the seats ride rather low and although the Indian Civic is 10 mm higher than the outgoing model, ingress and egress is a bit clumsy the first

few times until you get the hang of it. But you never buy a car for its looks alone, you do care about the performance too. So how is the new Civic? Well, first a disclaimer, this is a first drive, not a detailed test drive where I drive and experience a vehicle over a few days during my commute. We drove the car around the highways near Bengaluru airport and up the twisty roads on Nandi Hills. Initially, I had the i-DTEC which comes with a six-speed manual transmission. Now, I have a strong opinion about six-speed manual transmissions in India because I still believe it is one gear too many on any car. That said, on the highway you can easily put the car into sixth and just cruise at 80-100 km per hour, the diesel purring along. What does not purr along are the tyres? Because of the need to derive higher fuel economy, the i-DTEC comes with low rolling resistance tyres and those are noticeably noisy. You can drown that out by pumping the volume on the smart infotainment system, which is similar to those on other new Hondas, and comes with support for Apple CarPlay and Android Auto, standard across variants.

Now, on the twisty sections you really do need to mash the gears to keep the motor in its narrow power-band. While the car does take the corners very steadily indeed, you do feel that it could do a bit more. Maybe with grippier tyres it could. Then again, even with enthusiastic driving, the Civic Diesel returned almost 15 km per litre. This is clearly a car designed to be an economical long-distance hauler, but a boy racer.

So on to the iVTEC, first things first, there is no manual version on this Civic. Nope. Nada. Nyet. What you get is Honda's very nice Continuously Variable Transmission (CVT) with a Torque Converter and seven forward speeds as standard, as well as a paddle-shift system when you want to have fun. Now, Honda's CVTs are very smooth — I loved the CVT on the diesel Amaze for example — but they are not designed again for very enthusiastic driving. On regular day-to-day driving on the highway and in the city, gear shifts are brilliant and kick-down power when you need to get a move on gets delivered promptly. But you do start to sense some shift-lag when you start using the paddles a lot. Possibly I am saying this because dual-clutch gearboxes and their millisecond shifts have spoiled me. While this CVT is not what I would call lazy, it again feels tuned more to regular urban commuting.

And you know what? Urban commuting is what most buyers of the Civic will do, and once you begin to live with it, you can work your way around the CVT transmission and figure it out. As such both the iDTEC and iVTEC Civics are very well suited for that role and look fantastic as well. The problem Honda India faces has actually less to do with the Civic and more to do with the segment, because the segment is moribund. India's love affair with the Sports Utility Vehicle continues, anybody buying a car in the ₹15-18 lakh range is looking lustfully at the Hyundai Creta. The Civic, which one expects to match the Corolla Altis for price, meaning it would be around the ₹18-24 lakh segment, will have people look at the Hyundai Tucson, or have people who want space just look at the Toyota Innova. There is no doubt the new Honda Civic is a good car and an excellent looking one at that, but I'm not sure it can make the Indian buyer start looking at sedans again.

"If celebrities can wake up to the nightmares of a tattoo gone wrong, what are mere mortals like us? The countless instances of tattoos gone wrong with disastrous errors and weird translations happen because people fail to do their homework," says Malani.

His words of advice? "Never trust the Internet /Google. Try translating two languages that you know with its help and you know it can have errors — big ones. So, if you don't write/speak the language that your tattoo is





A NATURAL WONDER

Could dark chocolate boost your athletic performance?

Most of the research on dark chocolate has looked at cardiovascular health in people with pre-existing medical conditions, with only a limited focus put on exercise performance in a more healthy population.

ON YOUR BIKE

Putting dark chocolate to the exercise supplement test, nine moderately-trained male participants volunteered to undertake a series of baseline tests looking at their maximal oxygen uptake (VO2max), lung gas exchange measures and two-minute exercise bike time trial performance. They performed each trial two weeks apart under conditions of either consuming daily 40 grams of dark chocolate or white chocolate (which contains no polyphenols) leading up to the trial.

Dark chocolate consumption improved time trial performance relative to both the baseline conditions and also white chocolate consumption conditions. This equated to a 17 per cent greater distance covered when eating dark chocolate compared to the start of the experiment and 13 per cent more distance covered compared to eating white chocolate.

There was also a significant six per cent improvement in VO2max under the dark chocolate conditions com-

pared to baseline conditions. The same six per cent improvement was also seen when dark chocolate was eaten compared to white chocolate, but this didn't reach the level of statistical significance. There were no statistical differences in blood lactate, heart rate, or blood pressure between the different experimental conditions, but dark chocolate showed a trend for improving many of these measures.

Since the taste of dark chocolate is quite distinct, it was not possible to blind the

participants to what they were eating. So some placebo effect could have played a role if participants expected the dark chocolate to have a benefit.

WHAT IT ALL MEANS

This was only a very small study, but as far as proof of concept goes, it certainly gives a green light to more research in this area. When you put in context that all that is being used is a small amount of dark chocolate, then there appears little harm in athletes jumping the gun early and trying it for themselves.

BHARWA CHEESE MIRCHI

- WHAT YOU NEED**
- Green Chillies: 5
 - Yellow cheddar cheese: 20 gm
 - Goat cheese: 20 gm
 - Red capsicum: 10 gm

- Stuff the green chili halves with the goat cheese mixture.

- Prepare the batter with besan, and cornflour.
- Dip the stuffed green chili in



this batter and roll in the panko breadcrumbs.

- Deep fry the crumbed chillies till the color of breadcrumb is golden brown.
- Mix the chopped raw green aam papad and sweet chili sauce. Serve the fried chillies with this tangy sauce.

AVOCADO AND ROASTED BEETROOT TARTARE

- WHAT YOU NEED**
- Roasted beetroot: 240 gm
 - Salt as per taste
 - Black pepper as per taste
 - Olive oil: 40 ml
 - Avocado: 500 gm
 - Cucumber rounds: 60 gm
 - Edamame: 20 gm
 - Edible flower: 5
 - Mayonnaise: 20 gm
 - Balsamic caviar: 10 gm

- For marination**
- Lemon juice: 20 ml
 - Sugar: 30 ml
 - Water: 20 ml
 - Sesame seed paste: 10 gm
 - Soya sauce: 10 gm
 - Basil pesto: 20 gm

- For Avocado marination with spicy mayonnaise**
- Egg-less Mayonnaise (ready to use): 60 gm
 - Japanese chili paste: 10 gm

- For Garnish Edamame pods: 20gm

Beetroot flower: 5

METHOD

- Wash and peel the beetroots. Season them with salt and pepper, and rub with oil. Wrap them in silver foil and roast in the oven for about 15-20 minutes at 140 degree Celsius until they are cooked. Cool, and cut into small dices.
- Peel the avocado and cut into small dices.
- Slice cucumber into rounds and arrange on a plate in concentric circles. Make the basil pesto as normally made at home and keep aside. Make balsamic vinegar pearls with agar agar and keep aside.
- To make the marinade, mix together all the ingredients, and add beetroot and avocado to the it. Keep it aside for 5 minutes.
- Take a round mould and neatly layer the beetroot at the base, followed by a layer of avocado.

Eves aim high against England

After winning maiden series in New Zealand, Mithali and Co look to continue dominant run in home series

The aggressive Harmanpreet Kaur's injury-forced absence is likely to be felt but a confident Indian women's cricket team will look to make the home advantage count when it squares off against England in a three-match ODI series starting at Wankhede Stadium on Friday.

Fresh from a decent outing in New Zealand, where the team won the ODIs but were blanked 0-3 in T20 Internationals, the Indian team continues its ICC Championships engagements.

The team has to hold on to its position in the top-four of the world rankings till 2020 to get direct qualification for the 2021 World Cup.

All the three matches will be played at the Wankhede and India would be firm favourites. The Mithali Raj-led outfit had beaten England 2-1 the last time the visitors were here, in 2018.

Raj, whose position in the T20 squad has created quite a bit of controversy in the past few months, is still at the top of her game in the 50-over format. The 36-year-old became the first woman cricketer to play 200 ODIs for India during the tour of New Zealand a few weeks back.

However, the hosts will miss her regular deputy and T20 captain Harmanpreet, who was ruled out of the entire series with an ankle injury. She has been replaced by Harleen Deol.

Although Harmanpreet was off-colour during the series against New Zealand, she remains crucial for India in its new-found aggression.

But ICC's woman cricketer of the year Smriti Mandhana and the young and sprightly Jemimah Rodrigues can



be banked upon to provide the requisite spark. Mandhana, especially, was in top form in New Zealand and would be aiming to continue the fine run.

The team has had middle-order issues in the past and newly-appointed coach W V Raman would be keen to sort those out.

The home team's bowling has an all-round look with the pace attack being led by redoubtable veteran Jhulan Goswami and also comprising the likes of Shikha Pandey and Mansi Joshi.

With spin being a key element on

Indian wickets, the role of slow bowlers Deepti Sharma, Ekta Bisht and Poonam Yadav in the middle overs would be crucial.

The England women, on the other hand, are no pushovers in the 50-over format. They have experienced campaigners in top-order batting, such as Danni Wyatt (746 runs in 61 matches) and 28-year-old Heather Knight.

Knight, with 2,331 runs to her credit in 86 ODIs, displayed good form in the practice game against the Board Presidents XI and would be expected to

anchor the innings for the visitors.

With all-rounders like Sophie Ecclestone, experienced pacer Anya Shrubsole and accurate medium pacer Nat Sciver in the mix, England have the bowling attack to trouble the hosts.

Anya would also take confidence from her four-wicket haul in the warm-up game.

Team focused on getting direct entry into 2021 World cup: Mithali

Indian women's ODI team skipper Mithali Raj said the team is focused on avoiding the qualifiers ahead of the 2021 World Cup but reckoned it will be a major challenge facing World Cup champions England in the absence of injured Harmanpreet Kaur.

Mithali said her team is focused on holding on to its position in the top-four of the world rankings till 2020 to get direct qualification for the 2021 World Cup.

"It's a very important series for us, being number three right now in points table. Points are at stake and I definitely want the team to get direct entry (into the next World Cup). It's important to get as many points as possible from the series," she said on the eve of the series.

India had beaten England 2-1 the last time the visitors were here in 2018 but Mithali said facing the visitors without Harmanpreet will show the team's depth.

"England are a formidable side, being the World Cup champions and they will come strongly at us. We should be playing a positive brand of cricket," said Mithali.

"They've got their senior players back into the squad, and we are without one of our senior players. But this series will also show how we meet this challenge. It will reflect the depth of our team."



On the absence of Harmanpreet, Mithali said the injured player will be missed but her absence also provides chance to the youngsters to come good.

"She is one of the main players in the team for a long time, but it is also an opportunity for young players in the team to rise up and use the opportunity to step up and perform," said the India captain.

"Harman is not there because of injury. I should emphasise that we, as a batting unit, should take the (added) responsibility and whoever gets the opportunity should play that role," she added.

For a direct entry into the World Cup, Mithali and company need to hold on to their position in the top-four of the world rankings till 2020.

The equation becomes a bit more complex in the wake of the terror attack by a Pakistan-based terror-outfit in Pulwama in Kashmir and the outrage it has given rise to all over the country.

Now there's a distinct possibility that the Indian team may not line up against Pakistan and Mithali said she is aware of this sort of scenario.

"It's always been in our minds that we probably won't play Pakistan, and that's why, whatever matches we play against whoever, we should be going in by keeping in mind that we need those points," she remarked.

India had defeated New Zealand 2-1 in the recent ODI series in different conditions and Mithali said they will take the confidence into the series against England.

"It was our first win on the New Zealand soil, so it feels great to win a series there, but to come home and play England is completely different," she said.

"The conditions are different. We'll take a lot of positives and confidence from that series win, but our preparation and strategy differs from what it was in New Zealand."

Want to make history in India: Knight

Reigning World Cup champions England want to create history by defeating India in their own backyard for the first time in an ODI series, said visiting team captain Heather Knight on the eve of the opening clash.

"Yes, we have talked about it. It's something we want to do as a team. We want to make history. When we came here last year, it was a slightly younger team. We weren't able to do that; we lost that series 2-1," said Knight.

The two teams had played a memorable World Cup final in 2017 when hosts England

pulled off a sensational win.

"We have had some amazing games; that World Cup final was an amazing game to be involved in. Obviously the enormity of the occasion: to be in a WC final, to be sold out at Lord's. We've played some good games, including last year in Indian conditions as well."

According to Knight, her team's strength is its depth.

"The ODI cricket we've played in the last couple of years, including the World Cup in England, that's been very good. We have got performances from different players. We have got inexperience and a group that has been around for a while as well."



"We've got quite a settled batting line-up and everyone of the batters in the top six or seven are match-winners. So hopefully a lot more players can step up, as they have done in the last two years," she added.

Knight agreed that India will miss the injured Harmanpreet Kaur.

"She has been a very good player for them. She has been playing in the leagues around the world. I know what sort of player she is. Any team in the world would miss her."

On how to stop the in-form Smriti Mandhana, with whom she has played in the BBL in Australia, Knight said

that the India opener has some weaknesses which her bowlers would look to exploit.

"I have obviously played with Smriti in Hobart [Hurricanes], very recently. She played in my team, so I know her very well. I know she's a very good player. And having seen a lot of her, obviously, it gives us the chance to look at her weaknesses as well and try and figure out how we're going to exploit them in the series," she added.

Meanwhile Mithali was of the view that spinners would hold the key although because of the early starts there would be some moisture for the medium pacers to exploit.

England post record chase

Contrasting centuries by Jason Roy and Joe Root paced England to a comfortable six-wicket victory over the West Indies with their record one-day international run chase in a high-scoring opening game of a five-match series in Barbados on Wednesday.

Set what looked a daunting target after Chris Gayle's 24th ODI hundred anchored the home side to 360-8, Roy blazed 123 off 85 balls at the top of the order while Root cruised to a comparatively sedate 102 off 97 deliveries to take help the tourists reach their target with eight balls to spare.

In achieving the highest-ever ODI run chase in the Caribbean and the third-highest overall, England underlined their status as the top-ranked team in this format of the game and will be brimful of batting confidence heading into the second match at the same venue on Friday.

Fresh from a hundred in the lone warm-up match at the weekend, Roy was at his most ruthless against the hosts who missed key fast bowler Kemar Roach.

Roy set the pace in racing to a hundred off just 65 balls — the fastest-ever in ODIs in the Caribbean — and dominated an opening stand of 91 with Jonny Bairstow.

He maintained the charge through a 114-run second-wicket partnership with Root and by the time he fell in the 27th over to leg-spinner Devendra Bishoo, England were well on course.

Earlier, Gayle lit up the Kensington Oval with another display of power-hitting.

Playing his first ODI since the home series against Bangladesh last July and having

Stokes returned the best figures of three for 37, including the important wicket of Gayle in the 47th over.

Hardik out of Australia series

India all-rounder Hardik Pandya was on Thursday ruled out of the upcoming T20 and ODI series against Australia due to "lower back stiffness" with Ravindra Jadeja replacing him in the 50-over squad.

It is a minor setback for the team and Pandya, who returned to action during the limited-overs series in New Zealand after being handed a provisional suspension.

"The BCCI Medical team decided to rest the all-rounder and



let him undergo strength and conditioning work for his lower back at the National Cricket Academy (NCA) in Bengaluru. Pandya will begin his strength work from next week," said the BCCI in a statement.

"The T20I squad will now

consist of 14 members. Ravindra Jadeja has been named replacement for Hardik Pandya for the 5 ODIs," it added.

After returning from ban Pandya made instant impact in his comeback game, proving how crucial his presence is for the balance of the side.

The 25-year-old has so far played 11 Tests, 45 ODIs and 38 T20s.

His absence from the ODI squad gives Jadeja another opportunity to stake his claim in the squad for the World Cup to be played in the UK in May-July.

Iyer hits record-breaking ton

Young Shreyas Iyer hit a blazing 147 off 55 balls to help Mumbai defeat Sikkim by 154 runs in their Group C opening match of the Syed Mushtaq Ali trophy on Thursday.

Iyer's 147 is the highest T20 score by an Indian. He surpassed the record of Rishabh Pant, who had scored unbeaten 128 for Delhi Daredevils.

His 147 is also the 12th highest score by a batsman in the T20 cricket history.

Test specialist Cheteshwar Pujara also hit an unbeaten 100 in 61 balls, but the effort went in vain as Railways chased down Saurashtra's 189-run target with five wickets in hand at the Holkar Stadium.

At the Emeralds Heights International School ground, it was all Iyer show, who took the Sikkim bowlers to cleaners hammering 15 sixes and seven boundaries as Mumbai posted a mammoth 258/4 in 20 overs.

The domestic veterans then restricted Sikkim to 104/7 to start their campaign on a winning note.

Mumbai lost openers skipper Ajinkya Rahane (11) and young prodigy Prithvi Shaw (10) cheaply and were



reduced to 2-22.

But one-down Iyer and experienced Surya Kumar Yadav joined forces as they hammered the opposition bowlers and conjured a 213-run stand

for the third wicket.

It was an absolute carnage with Iyer being the more aggressive of the two.

24-year-old Iyer raced to his 100 in just 38 balls.

Surya too played a handy knockoff 63 in just 33 balls with eight boundaries and two other shots over the fence.

Sikkim was never in the hunt to chase the total and their innings ended at 104/7.

For Mumbai, spinner Shams Mulani and pacer Shardul Thakur picked two wickets each, while Dhawal Kulkarni, Shubham Ranjane and Tushar Deshpande picked a wicket each.

In another Group C match, Pujara hit a stroke-filled unbeaten 100 off 61 balls, with 14 boundaries and a six, and his team, Saurashtra, to 188/3 in 20 overs.

But contributions from the middle order helped Railways overhaul the target with two balls to spare.

Meanwhile at Mulapedu, Jharkhand pulled off a thrilling three-run win over holders Delhi in a Group 'A' match.

Batting first, Jharkhand rode on Virat Singh's unbeaten 70 to make 158 for 4 in 20 overs against an attack that included Test paceman Ishant Sharma.

Delhi fell short by three runs despite a brave knockoff of 70 by Dhruv Shorey.

In other matches, Kerala thrashed Manipur by 83 runs and Jammu and Kashmir beat Nagaland by nine wickets in an one-sided encounter.
