Pak kept in FATF grey terror list

The international terror financing watchdog Financial Action Task Force (FATF) on Friday condemned the Pulwama terror attack that martyred 44 CRPF jawans and decided to continue the 'Grey' listing of Pakistan for its failure to stop funding of terrorist groups such as Jaish-e-Mohammad, Lashkar-e-Tayyiba and Jamat-ul-Dawa. The Paris headquartered FATF observed that Pakistan is not properly understanding the risks of terror financing and there are many deficiencies in maintaining proper actions to curb terror financing. In a statement, the FATF said Pakistan should continue to work on implementing its action plan to address its strategic deficiencies, including by adequately demonstrating its proper understanding of the terror financing risks posed by the terrorist groups and conducting supervision on a risk-sensitive basis.

"The FATF notes with grave concern and condemns the terrorist attack last week that killed at least 44 Indian security forces in Pulwama," it said after the week-long FATF plenary held in Paris. "Pakistan has revised its terror financing risk assessment. However, it does not demonstrate a proper understanding of the TF risks posed by Daesh (ISIS), Al-Qaida, JuD, FIF (Falah-e-Insaniyat Foundation), LeT, JeM (Jaish-e-Mohammad), HQN (Haqqani Network) and persons affiliated with the Taliban," the statement said. Given the limited progress on action plan items due in January 2019, the FATF urged Pakistan to swiftly complete its action plan, particularly those with timelines of May 2019. An Indian official, who attended the FATF plenary, explained that placement in compliance document means putting the country in 'Grey' list and it will be reviewed again in June 2019. In June 2018, Pakistan was

placed in the 'Grey' list and given a 27-point action plan by the FATF. This plan was reviewed as the last Plenary in October 2018 and for the second time in this week-long meeting. The decision has been taken after several rounds of deliberations during the plenary where India submitted new information about Pakistan-based terrorist groups, including Jaish-e-Mohammad, responsible for the Pulwama attack. The FATF continuing Pakistan with the 'Grey' listing means downgrading of the country by multilateral lenders like IMF, World Bank, ADB, EU and also a reduction in risk rating by Moody's, S&P and Fitch, a security official said. Pakistan was nominated for a detailed review of its "serious deficiencies" in countering terror financing in February 2018. This nomination was supported by the US, the United Kingdom, France, Germany

and India, the official said. At the end of this plenary, the FATF has observed that several deficiencies remain in Pakistan's legal regime in dealing with terror financing. Since June 2018, Pakistan has made a high-level political commitment (statement by its Minister of Finance) to work with and address its strategic counter-terrorist financing-related deficiencies. At the start of its deliberations, all FATF members observed a minute of silence for the 44 CRPF jawans who were martyred. The President of FATF expressed sincere condolences to the people and the Government of India. The FATF currently has 35 members and two regional organisations — European Commission and Gulf Cooperation Council. The FATF also said Pakistan should continue to work on implementing its action plan to address its strategic deficiencies, including by adequately demonstrating its

proper understanding of the terror financing risks posed by the terrorist groups and conducting supervision on a risk-sensitive basis, demonstrating that remedial actions and sanctions are applied in cases of Anti-Money Laundering (AML) and Combating Financing of Terrorism (CFT) violations and that these actions have an effect on AML/CFT compliance by financial institutions. Pakistan should demonstrate that competent authorities are cooperating and taking action to identify and take enforcement action against illegal money or value transfer services (MVTs), demonstrating that authorities are identifying cash couriers and enforcing controls on illicit movement of currency and understanding the risk of cash couriers being used for TF, improving inter-agency coordination including between provincial and federal authorities on combating TF risks besides others. UNSC names JeM for Pulwama, China belittles resolution

The UN condemnation came a day after Pakistan's Permanent Representative to the UN Maleeha Lodhi met top UN leaders, including with Secretary-General Antonio Guterres to brief them about the escalating tensions in the region in the wake of the Pulwama attack but her efforts did not bear any fruit.



Even after UNSC condemned the Pulwama strike as "terrorism" China continued to oppose any mention of terrorism in the statement, said a person familiar with the diplomatic parleys on the issue at the UN headquarters. China, a permanent member of the UN Security Council, has over the years used its veto power to scuttle a move by India at the UN to put Jaish-e-Mohammad founder Masood Azhar on a global terror list. The UNSC comprising 15 permanent and non-permanent members, including China on Thursday condemned in the "strongest terms" the "heinous and cowardly" terror attack perpetrated by Pakistan-based terror group Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM), in a show of solidarity and support to India.

a proposal to regularise the service of contractual employees in the Health Department who have completed six years of continuous service. Staff nurses, laboratory assistants, technicians, pharmacists and health workers would be regularised. As many as 1,409 staff nurses, 227 lab technicians, 48 pharmacists, 27,30 MPHW (F) and 588 MPHW(M) will be regularised. Besides, a proposal to amend the Odisha Homoeopathic Medical Education Service Method of Recruitment and Condition of Service Rules, 2013 was approved. As per the amended Rules, the upper age limit for recruitment of homoeopathic doctors will be increased from 32 years to 40 years. The Cabinet also approved a proposal to frame the Odisha Heads of Department (Method of Recruitment and Conditions of Service of Establishment Officers, Administrative Officers in the Officer of Heads

of Departments) Common Cadre Rules 2019. Similarly, the Cabinet also okayed the framing of the Odisha Laboratory Technician Service (Methods of Recruitment and Conditions of Service) Rules, 2019. As many as 799 contractual Laboratory Technicians will be regularized under the new Rules. The State exchequer will have an annual burden of Rs 13,46,10,000. According to the decision, the framing of the Odisha Nursing Service (Methods of Recruitment and Conditions of Service) Rules 2019 was approved. As many as 3,998 Staff Nurses will be regularized and, for this, the State Exchequer will have a financial burden of Rs 80,43,93,600. The Government also took a decision for execution of Rural Pipe Water Supply projects under one package to provide safe drinking water in Boudh district out of Basudha funding. Anout 2,92,511 people of 747 villages under two blocks will benefit. The tender was awarded to the Larson and Tubro at Rs 427.59 crore. The Additional Block Development Officers (Methods of Recruitment and Conditions of Service) Ryules 1992 would be amended to fill up ABDO posts from among

Gram Panchayat Extension Officers and Progress Assistants by relaxing the service period as five years from the existing 10 years. As per a proposal approved, two ULB High Schools of Jharsuguda Municipality and Angul Municipality will be transferred to the control of the School and Mass Education Department. A proposal was also approved as per which a 'Programme Management Unit would be set up at State level to provide technical support to Odisha State Aahaar Society. The cost of the Aahaar Meal was enhanced from Rs 20 to 23. However, beneficial will continue to pay Rs 5 per meal. Provision of night meals at Aahaar centres also got Cabinet nod. A tender for the Mega Lift Project Cluster-DMF, to be executed with intake points on Brahmani, Baitarini, Mahanadi and Ib River in the districts of Jajpur, Keonjhar and Jharsuguda was awarded to the Megha Engineering and Infrastructure Ltd at Rs 432,37,50,000. Besides two more mega lift-irrigation projects of Water Resources Department, KALLA Scholarship Scheme, Rs 3,000-crore bank guarantee to GRIDCO were approved.

MISBEHAVIOUR WITH MARTYR'S KIN Cong, BJP lodge plaints, demand MLA's arrest

Samantray has apologised

Even though Cuttack-Barabati BJD MLA Debasish Samantray has apologised twice for shoving a relative of martyred CRPF Jawan Manoj Behera, the video of which went viral, the Congress and the BJP on Friday lodged police complaints against the MLA demanding his arrest. While the Mahila Congress lodged a complaint against Samantaray at Badambadi police station in Cuttack, another complaint was filed by the Puri district Youth Congress in the Town police station in the holy town. A Youth Congress leader Alok Dash said the BJD MLA has disrespected the nation by manhandling a relative of a brave soldier, who lost his life fighting against the country's enemies. After a Pakistan TV channel aired the incident, the

entire country is ashamed. Similarly, the State BJP filed a complaint at the Capital police station alleging that the MLA has disrespected the nation by his misbehaviour with the kin of the martyred jawan. Former Lieutenant General and BJP leader Narayan Mohanty said it is unfortunate that Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has not taken action against Samantray. This shows he has no respect for soldiers. The incident has been aired by all Pakistani TV channels. This is humiliating for the State and the country. However, BJD spokesperson Pratap Deb said Samantray has already apologised and the party would take a call on action to be taken against him.

Matric exam paper leak: 8 teachers axed

The Board of Secondary Education (BSE), which conducts High School Certificate (Matriculation) Examinations, on Friday suspended four Centre Superintendents and four Invigilators for their alleged role in spreading images of the first day's question paper on social media. The examinations began from Friday and will continue till March 8. "FIRs in this connection will be lodged in order to initiate criminal proceedings against the erring Centre Superintendents and Invigilators," said BSE President Jahan Ara Begum. All of them are either headmasters or masters of different schools in Nuapada, Koraput and Dhenkanal districts. BSE sources said, adding that the examinations would not be cancelled. Earlier in the day, as the examination began at 10 am, images of the question papers went viral on the social media.

Reacting to the development, the BSE President said some insiders might have taken the images of the question papers on their mobile phones and shared them on the social media to create rumors of question leak. "Technically, this is not question paper leak as the examinees only saw these images after the day's examination was over," Begum said. She further disclosed that the BSE this time had taken the help of certain secret security measures by which the examination center can be identified from where the images of the question paper had been taken. Notably, the BSE had also faced similar situation in the 2018 Matriculation examination when images of the question papers went viral on the social media within half-an-hour into the examinations almost on all the days. Although these mischievous activities did not affect the fairness of the examination, the BSE, nevertheless, had faced a lot of criticism.

Another leopard in city! panic among locals

A couple of days after a leopard was captured from the Biju Patnaik International Airport (BPIA) premises here by forest officials, another leopard was reportedly sighted at Talasahi in the Ranganamatia area of the city on Thursday night. "I had come out of the house at around 9.30 pm yesterday when I spotted the leopard in a bush. It was around three feet high and five feet long. Later, I immediately ran away from the spot and the animal also vanished," claimed a local resident, who reportedly spotted the animal. This has triggered panic among the residents of Ranganamatia near the



Mancheswar railway station as reportedly the pugmarks of the leopard were also found in the adjoining land. Officials of city forest division rushed to the spot after getting information and started inspecting the pugmarks to establish the identity of the animal. Sources said the forest officials are planning to carry out patrolling in the area on Friday

night; and if required, further steps like setting up cages would be taken to capture the animal. Experts said that with the habitat of wild animals being destroyed in the Chandaka forest, the animals are straying into human habitations in search of food. Earlier on Sunday, a five-year-old male leopard had strayed into the Palaspalli area near the airport. The animal was later captured by forest officials near the airport cargo terminal gate and later released into Chandaka forest on Wednesday.

Extinct Fernandina species theory turns turtle

Giant tortoise sighted after 100 years in Ecuador

Conservationists are thrilled at the discovery of a species of giant tortoise — believed to have been extinct for more than 100 years — from the remote volcanic island of Galapagos in Ecuador. In celebration of this historic discovery, the Turtle Conservancy and the Global Wildlife Conservation are pledging a \$1,00,000 to further conservation efforts of the Fernandina Giant Tortoise.



Fernandina Giant Tortoise last sighted in 1906. The rediscovery has raised hopes to breeding the species which is listed by the International Union for

Conservation of Nature (IUCN) as "critically endangered and possibly extinct." Forrest Galante, biologist and host of Animal Planet's

"Extinct or Alive", who had stumbled upon the adult female tortoise, said it to be around 100 years old. Galante's team, including Galapagos national park ranger, Jeffery Malaga and the director of the Galapagos Conservancy, Washington Tapia, crossed a three-mile stretch of hardened lava flow to arrive at an area identified the previous day as potential habitat that could support a population of Fernandina tortoise, according to a statement here by Animal Planet's, an American cable channel owned by Discovery Inc and devoted to series and documentaries about wild animals and domestic pets. Having positively identified tortoise scat in the field, the team led by Galante successfully located an active bedding site before finding the animal

nearby. The tortoise was found sheltering from the equatorial sun, buried deep under a pile of brush. A team of international turtle biologists at the Turtle Conservancy studied photos and video of the tortoise and confirmed it is likely to be Chelonoidis phantasticus. "Since only one other specimen of this species has ever been found (a deceased male collected in 1906), we have never seen a female of the species," said Anders Rhodin of the Turtle Conservancy and IUCN specialist group. The female tortoise is in good health but underweight, unsurprising considering the sparse vegetation in the area she lived in on the volcano. She has been taken to the Fausto Llerena Tortoise Breeding Center, a national park facility in Isla Santa Cruz.

Matric question paper leaked on first day


An hour after the commencement of the annual High School Certificate (HSC) examination conducted by the Board of Secondary Education (BSE), the question paper for the first day was reportedly leaked on social media.

The MIL (Odia) question paper surfaced on WhatsApp in Nuapada and Dhenkanal districts just after the students appeared in the exam at 10 am.

However, the School & Mass Education Minister Badri Narayan Patra denied the allegation. He said the mobile phones are completely prohibited at the examination centres and the question papers have been kept in tight security at the nodal centres.

BSE President Jahan Ara Begum also refuted the report, saying the question papers went viral after the examination.

"As the first part of the exam had already ended and

the question paper went viral on social media after exam, we cannot term it as 'leak,' she told media.

"This incidence will not have any effect on conducting the examination because the students had entered into the exam halls at 9 am. The question papers were leaked after the exam," Begum emphasised.

"We made tight security arrangements for the smooth conduct of the examination. The mobile phone was com-

pletely banned. Despite it, if anyone is found guilty of violating the instructions, disciplinary action will be taken against him after the probe," she added.

She appealed to the parents and students not to panic over the "leaked" question papers.

This year, a total of 5,72,699 students are appearing in the examination at 2,830 centres.

Notably, 304 nodal centres have been set up across the State for the BSE Matric examination. The authorities have formed 693 despatch teams to transfer the question papers from nodal centres to the exam centres.

A special squad under the supervision of district Collectors, 58 district-level squads and 44 BSE squads have been formed to curb malpractice during the examination. The Collectors and SPs have been instructed to ensure smooth conduct of the exam across the State.

40 students take risky ferry ride to appear in exam

Putting their lives at risk, around 40 students of the Padiari School in Astaranga block of Puri district had to take a ferry ride on a foggy morning to appear in the annual HSC Examination that began on Friday.

With no road connectivity due to the half-built Biju Setu over the Devi river at Talada, the students had no option but to take a boat ride



to reach the examination centre at the Surendra Nath Vidyapeeth.

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had laid the foundation-stone for the bridge in 2014. The project was scheduled for completion last year. But it is still lying incomplete for reasons best known to the officials concerned.

Once completed, the bridge would connect Jagatsinghpur and Puri districts.

Student injured in mishap on way to exam

A student of the Muktapasi High School in Dhenkanal district could not appear in the HSC Examination as he was injured in a road mishap near Barihapur under the Parjang police limits on NH-53 on his way to an examination centre on Friday.

Victim Bulu Nayak of Kamarda village was admitted to a hospital. Bulu was riding a bike with his two family members to reach the examination centre at

Kankadasoda. A truck coming from the opposite direction hit the bike. All three of them, including Bulu's brother Shantanu, who was driving the bike, and father Maheswar, sustained critical injuries. The truck driver fled the spot.

Later, Fire Services personnel rescued the three injured and admitted them to the Parjang Community Health Centre (CHC). Shantanu was later shifted to the SCB Medical College Hospital in Cuttack after his condition deteriorated.

Gold worth ₹10L seized at city airport

Smuggled by Kolkata man from Bangkok

Officials of the Air Intelligence Unit of the Customs Department seized 283 grams gold from a passenger at the Biju Patnaik International Airport here on Friday.


The gold was estimated to be worth around ₹10 lakh.

Suspecting the movement of a passenger, who arrived at the airport from Bangkok by an Air Asia flight, the sleuths searched him thoroughly and found the gold from his shirt buttons.

"Acting on spot intelligence, officers of Air Intelligence Unit, BPIA intercepted a passenger of Indian origin hailing from Kolkata, who had arrived from Bangkok by Air Asia flight No FD-112 on Thursday. Search of his hand baggage led to recovery of silver-coated metal rings made of gold of foreign origin tactfully concealed in the buttons of garments. The gold collectively weighed 283.240 grams having purity of 99.9% and valued at Rs 9, 83, 409 lakh," Assistant Commissioner of Customs, BBI Airport, BB Pattanaik said.

The smuggled gold was seized under the Customs Act, 1962. Further investigation was on into the incident, the official added.

Earlier on February 19, gold weighing 959.990 grams



and valued at over Rs 33.16 lakh had been seized from a woman passenger at the airport. The woman, a resident of Maharashtra, had arrived at the airport by an Air India flight from Delhi.

With many other such incidents in the past, the city airport seems to have turned a haven for smuggling of gold since it began flight operations to Bangkok more than a year ago.

Irregularities in ASO Test alleged

'Youth against Corruption' seeks exam re-conducted online

An alleged incident of glaring corruption has come to the fore in the Odisha Public Service Commission (OPSC) affairs in conducting the ASO Test 2019.

The OPSC had released that ASO examination would be held on December 23, 2018, but subsequently took a plea to reschedule the examination to January 20, 2019 on the ground that they could not be able to make arrangements for extra 70,000 candidates. In this regard, they issued a notice on January 3, 2019.

Thus, the postponing of the examination was based on personal whims and caprices of an insensitive administration. The final date of the ASO examination collided with

other important recruitment examination like IBPS clerk mains, ALP CBT 2, RPF Eastern Zone and ISRO examinations.

Earlier, the protesting candidates had approached the Governor seeking his intervention of the rescheduling of the ASO Exam date. The Governor too wrote to the OPSC with an instruction, "no one should be deprived of his basic rights of giving examination."

The aspirants also moved SAT which gave a verdict asking the OPSC to reconsider the examination date. Consequently 30,000 aspirants to the ASO examination with brilliant academic records were safely eliminated from the scene as the OPSC neither listens to the demand of the candidates nor acted upon the advice of the Governor.

Again an alleged irregularity in the examination hall has angered many of the candidates. It is reported that about

20 candidates got tampered seal question papers in the Unit -VI Government High School, Bhubaneswar and when they complained to the superintendent it was not heard. On the other hand, the Superintendent and the Invigilator called the PCR to threaten the outrageous aspirants. One police officer reportedly snatched away the smart phone of a candidate who had already recorded all the conversations and the confession of the Examination Controller relating the tampered question.

At the Sai Engineering College Baleswar, a centre for Divyang students, while a student was doing open malpractice with the help of an Invigilator, another student named Sibum Kumar Mohanty opposed it. Thereafter, his

answer papers were turn into pieces by the other candidate. Angered by the magnitude of rampant corruptions, a large number of aspirants for ASO job have united under the banner of the "Youth against Corruption" and started dhara in the lower PMG area together with the Divyang candidates on January 5, 2019. They have also approached the OPSC Chairman to conduct an online examination for the ASO paper. But the OPSC Chairman has turned a deaf ear to them.

The candidates' demand is genuine. The examination should be cancelled and held afresh through online. The constitutional body OPSC should be like caesura's wife above suspicion," opined intellectuals and retired administrators.

Stress on intelligence sharing, curbing LWE

Senior police officials of Odisha and their counterparts of five neighbouring States deliberated on the security measures for the general elections at an Inter-State Coordination meeting here on Friday.

Speaking to the media about the meet, Odisha Home Secretary Asit Kumar Tripathi said, "We have good cooperation with neighbouring States and it has led to curbing left-wing extremism (LWE). Such meetings are necessary before elections. When the Election Commission of India (ECI) visited the State, they had also sought inter-State police cooperation."

Intelligence sharing among the States and security measures in Maoist-hit areas were among the major topics discussed at the meet.



Odisha DGP Dr RP Sharma said, "We already have a mechanism of intelligence sharing and joint operations. We have to work more for joint operations. Specially, in Andhra Pradesh - Odisha border and our border with Chhattisgarh, there are certain areas where there is a security vacuum. We have to concentrate on those areas."

Odisha and its neighbouring States to some extent are facing LWE menace. Therefore, we need to be alert ahead of elec-

tions and have better coordination in sharing of intelligence inputs, says DGP RP Sharma. "Almost all the neighbouring States, to some extent or other, are grappling with LWE. Year 2018 has been a relatively successful year for almost all the States including Odisha in curbing Maoist menace. During elections, the Maoists step up their activities and they have already given an election boycott call. We have to be totally alert," Sharma added.

Let everyone have free, equal access to State resources

The development of the marginalised section in Odisha depends on access to natural, intellectual and financial resources. It is the duty of the Government to ensure free access of all people to various forms of resources of the State without legal, social and physical barriers of any form. But the poor and marginalised section has been deprived of owning resources for their development largely due to failure of last 70 years elected Government in implementing the constitutional mandate which very clearly spells out State's role in ensuring democratisation of resources of any form. Lack of resources makes people unskilled wage labourers and migrant workers in large scale.

, support price, and temporary cash distribution in the name of agriculture development out of public money are certainly not the solution to persistent economic backwardness and cannot lead to a higher standard of living of the common masses, unless productive assets are not given to them. Rather it is an attempt by the Government to make people unproductive and forced them to live under mercy of State charity in most undignified manner.

How long the schemes such as Rs1 per kg rice, Rs 5 meal and schemes of Rs 5,000 for farm labourers and farmers and free distribution of mobile will continue out of public fund? Does such show of charity really help? How these schemes are contributing to improve the standard of living of the poor with dignity by generating employment, income, production and self-sufficiency is a matter of observation. Political decisions of ruling elite must not go for a bad economy that delink people from production process and encourage wage slavery and distress migration.

Historically, people's ownership over resources and its utilisation has been taken away by the subsequent rulers of the past and even after the implementation of constitutional

This can mitigate lot of the marginalised

governances, it is found that largely the provisions are not implemented. The trend has been continuing without much change over it.

For any kind of production, employment and income, productive assets are highly required and these resources such as land, water, forest and minerals are slowly getting privatized for the corporates while the rights of marginalised people of the locality are denied. For last seventy years, our natural resources and financial resources are handed over to private corporates but not to the people to make a living out of it. The sea coast, rivers, lake, water bodies, water resources, forest, timber, minor forest produces, hills, minerals, pastures, agriculture fields etc., are leased out in through-away price depriving the locals of livelihood. Their legal rights and physical access are restricted through legislations and by using State police. This process has alienated the people from resources as well as production process and pushing them to vulnerability without resources.

Not only natural resources but also financial resources created out of budgetary allocation and institutional financial arrangements by nation-

alized banks are not reaching to vast majority of marginalized sections. The credit policy for the marginalized by Reserve Bank of India has been violated by all the banks in case of banking with the poor. The policy of collateral security, bank guarantee, mortgage and schemes and project related deals are not adhered to. The people of the backward areas and areas having large concentration of marginalized sections have very minimal institutional credit facilities to meet the timely credit requirement of the people.

While moving towards knowledge society the third most important resource is intellectual resources that can be acquired through quality education but the education system of the State is graded with social and economic status. The children of the rural poor and marginalized sections are sent to residential schools and vernacular medium while the upper class/caste urban rich are sent to quality English medium schools. The language policy and medium of instruction and curricula are also qualitatively different. The teachers and non-teaching staffs of the so-called residential schools run

by the Government are less paid and the quality of teaching is not at par with other schools. The scope of higher education and technical education with trend of privatization has become minimal for the poor and marginalized. The policy of affirmative action in education has not been monitored by the State Government and even the policy is not being followed to ensure the representation of the students as per their percentage of population of the State. Education is one of the important means of building human resources.

The quality education, public employment opportunities, credit facilities, subsidies, permits, supply, contracts, lease and all other forms of intellectual and financial resources are available to very few people of the State who have monopolized these opportunities, created out of public fund, for generation together with active political backing through legislations and policy decisions. The Government must widen the scope of universal public employment through State investment and democratise its scope by abolishing all forms of barriers against the marginalized sections while ensuring their full participation in social and economic life.

not homogeneous and there are diversity and local specific differences based on status and identities where social and language barriers are major reasons of economic backwardness as people of lower caste and linguistic minority with historical denial have restricted access to intellectual and financial resources.

The unfair distribution of resources has contributed to the growth of inequality and widening the disparity at regional and social level and furthering the process of economic marginalisation. It is worsening the condition of the people. The rich - poor gap is getting widened and vast section of people is getting detached from the production process making them dependent on State relief. This is not a sign of a good economy. The State much make attempt to link people with production by ensuring ownership over productive assets such as land, water, quality education, institutional credit and socially empower them by enhancing their social, political participation at various level. The ongoing economic interventions may help a ruling class to gain short term political power but it will have huge ramifications in the long run.

BJD food scheme for 'vote security': Niranjan

The Re 1-a-kg rice for the poor under the NFSA and the Odisha Government's own food security scheme has become a mockery, alleged PCC president Niranjan Patnaik on Friday.

In a statement, he said all these schemes primarily are meant for the BPL families and families in distress. But no proper procedure is being followed while identifying the beneficiaries.

Giving an example, the PCC chief said the farmer who sells 100 bags of paddy in kharif season gets the same benefits under food security as the small and marginal farmer who sells one bag of rice. The recently launched KALIA

scheme is also equally applicable to all. Does it really serve the purpose, asked Patnaik.

He said the State Government must implement different schemes for medium, small and marginal farmers, labourers and landless poor, so that each scheme targets and fulfills the needs of groups.

Patnaik said as per the State Government data, as many as 77 per cent of the total population of Odisha has been covered under Re1- a- kg rice scheme. If this is true, then 77 per cent of our population is living Below Poverty Line (BPL) as per 2011 census.

But another Government data says, as per 2011 census, the number of BPL families in Odisha declined to around 33 per cent. There is a gross mis-

match in these two figures, which must be clarified by the State Government. This is meant only to lure voters, alleged Patnaik. He said the procedure of implementation of the scheme is dubious.

Because of the callous attitude of the State Government, many ghost beneficiaries are availing the major benefits, whereas the needy are left out. Last month, the Food Commissioner of the State cited his grave concerns saying that 2 lakh ghost beneficiaries in Odisha are receiving food grains under the Public Distribution Systems (PDS). The food security scheme launched by the BJD Government is meant for vote security, alleged Patnaik.

OMC pays ₹500-crore dividend to State Govt

Opposition slams Cong Govt, dubs Punjab Budget 'bundle of lies'

Even as the Congress and Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLAs came out with slew of suggestions for Punjab Finance Minister Manpreet Badal, the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) on Friday dubbed the state Budget a "bundle of lies" while alleging that the government had "exaggerated income and suppressed expenditure".

Opening the debate on the budget, presented by Manpreet on February 18, Congress MLA Rana Gurjit Singh stressed on taking benefit from the centrally sponsored schemes, while at the same time lashing out at the state bureaucracy for not informing the Ministers about the same.

"Officers know everything about Centre's schemes, but no one ever mention it to thge Minister because of which the State remain despieved of central funds and getting benefits from it," said Rana Gurjit while indicating at the officers' gallery leaving them smiling.

Besides, Rana Gurjit batted for crop diversification, increasing transports subsidy to Rs two from Re one, promoting beet plantation, besides promoting the state's agro based industry. "We should not allow maize from outside the state, and let all state's requirement should be met from within the state only," he insisted.

He also demanded that the distribution of available water in the entire state should be "relooked" by a panel, and Jalandhar should get its "rightful share".

In addition, Rana Gurjit demanded that a summit "for agriculture solutions" be organised by the government in which experts, and other stakeholders would discuss the changes the Punjab agriculture sector needs, improvement required, among other things.

AAP MLA Kultar Singh Sandhwan stressed for responsible administration, besides promoting more and more state specific research programmes in Ludhiana's Punjab Agriculture University (PAU). He also maintained all parties should join their heads together to formulate policies to save the state's agriculture.

Alkali Dal legislator and former Finance Minister Parminder Singh Dhindsa claimed that the state's fiscal position had been "deteriorating" ever since the Congress Government came to power, against its claims of fiscal consolidation.

"On the contrary, Punjab's economic situation is dismal..The Punjab Government ha become totally dependent on the Centre for meeting its expenditure," he said.

Claiming that Punjab's fiscal health was deteriorating, Dhindsa said: "Economic growth, which was 7.16 percent in 2017-18, dropped to 6.27 percent in 2018-19, and in 2019-20, it is estimated to be 5.93 percent. We know the target of 5.93 percent is also unachievable."

"In the budget, the government has exaggerated income and suppressed expenditure," he alleged while accusing the Government of not making efforts to stabilise or shore up revenue.

Hitting out at the Congress for blaming the erstwhile SAD-BJP dispensation for the state's growing debt, he claimed that the incumbent government had already raised Rs 30,000 crore of debt in the last two years and it would raise another Rs 28,000 crore during the next fiscal year.

"After raising so much debt, they now talk about fiscal consolidation," he said, adding that the previous government had raised a debt of about Rs 89,000 crore during its 10-year regime.

Dhindsa, claiming that the state's tax revenue was not rising, said that the total gap between the state's income and expenditure was about Rs 15,000 crore.

"It comprises an unfunded gap of Rs 4,323 crore, Rs 1,500 crore of excess revenue, Rs 1,150 crore of reduced salary, wage bill, Rs 4,500 crore of pending power subsidy and Rs 4,000 crore of pending treasury bills," he said.

Dhindsa also lashed out at the Congress government for raising Rs 6,600 crore of loan by pledging the future income of Punjab Infrastructure Development Board and Rural Development Fund. "When we used to raise money this way,

they criticised us. Now they are following the same practice," he said, adding that the Congress had been "exposed".

"Allocation of funds does not matter when the government has no money to spend," Dhindsa said claiming that though the Government had introduced no new taxes in the budget, it would do so after the Lok Sabha elections.

AAP ON FRIDAY STAGED WALKOUT ON MAUR MANDI BOMB BLAST ISSUE

AAP MLAs, during the zero hour, staged a walk-out on the issue of 2017 Maur Bomb blast in which seven, including five children, were killed, saying that the government had failed to nab the culprits and give compensation to the families of the victims.

During the zero hour, AAP MLA Jagdev Sing Kamalu raised the issue saying that the families of those killed or injured in the Bomb blast dated January 31, 2017, at the election rally of Congress candidate Harminder Jassi had not yet been given compensation nor arrested the perpetrators.

When the Government failed to give a satisfactory reply to the question, all AAP MLAs staged a walk-out of the House amid sloganeering against the government.

Leader of Opposition in Vidhan Sabha Harpal Singh Cheema, later talking with media, demanded that the Government should immediately arrest those behind the blast and grant compensation of Rs two crore each to the next of kin of those killed and Rs 10 lakh to those injured.

Stop indulging in drama: Captain to Badal

A day after Punjab's former Chief Minister Parkash Singh Badal offered himself for arrest to the Special Invetogating Team probing 2015 sacrilege and related firing cases, his successor Capt Amarinder Singh on Friday termed it as "an obvious panic reaction to public exposure". At the same time, Capt Amarinder warned Badal against persistently indulging in theatrics, adding that these would not help him regain the lost political ground for the Akalis.

Reacting strongly to Badal's dramatic challenge to 'put him in jail' if the Chief Minister dared, Capt Amarinder ridiculed it as another piece of drama from Badal Senior, who was finding himself cornered on the issue of the sacrilege cases, in the backdrop of the

findings of Justice Ranjit Singh Commission. "Why is he so rattled if he has nothing to hide," said Capt Amarinder, pointing out that the former Chief Minister was in the habit of indulging in theatrics, especially when faced with an uncomfortable situation.

Pointing out that he had never mentioned Badal or anyone else, for that matter, in connection with the Behbal Kalan and Kotkapura firing incidents and desecration of Guru Granth Sahib, the Chief Minister wondered if Badal's reaction was a case of guilt conscience rising to the fore. Capt Amarinder, rejecting the Akali patron's allegation of a political witch-hunt by his government, said that such shameful and petty tactics were the domain of the Akalis, and the Congress leadership had never believed in indulging in such acts.

Modi expressed his gratitude for the prestigious honour and said, "this award belongs not to me personally, but to the people of India."

"The success that India has achieved in the last five years is due to aspirations, inspiration and efforts of the people of India. On their behalf, I accept the award and express my gratitude," he said.

He said he was honoured that the award is being conferred on him in the year that India celebrates the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. He dedicated the USD 200,000 prize money to

'Namami Gange Programme', which is flagship programme of his government to accomplish the twin objectives of effective abatement of pollution, conservation and rejuvenation of River Ganga.

Modi is the 14th recipient of the award and the past laureates included former UN Secretary General Kofi Annan, German Chancellor Angela Merkel and renowned international relief organizations

like Doctors Without Borders and Oxfam.

The Seoul Peace Prize was established in 1990 to commemorate the success of the 24th Olympic Games held in Seoul. The award was established to crystallise Korean people's yearning for peace on the Korean peninsula and in the rest of the world.

Speaking at the event, Prime Minister Modi expressed concern over the growing men-

ace of terrorism and recalled that a few weeks before the Seoul Olympics in 1988, an organisation called Al-Qaeda was formed.

SC to hear pleas seeking review of Rafale verdict on February 26

The Supreme Court will hear on February 26 the two petitions seeking review of its December 14 verdict that had dismissed pleas challenging the deal between India and France for procurement of 36 Rafale fighter jets.

The review petition has been filed by former Union ministers Yashwant Sinha and Arun Shourie as also activist lawyer Prashant Bhushan.

The hearing of the pleas will be conducted in chambers and not in open court.

The trio said the top court had relied upon "patently incorrect" claims made by the government in an unsigned note given in a sealed cover in the court.

Sinha, Shourie and Bhushan have claimed that the judgement was based on "errors apparent on the face of the record" and non-consideration of subsequent information which has come to light would cause a grave miscarriage of justice.

Besides seeking review of the judgement, they have also sought hearing of the plea in an open court.

The top court will also hear the petition filed by AAP's Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh through advocate Dheeraj Singh seeking review of the December 14 verdict.

On December 14, 2018, the apex court had dismissed various pleas challenging the deal between India and France for procurement of 36 Rafale jets saying there was no occasion to



"really doubt the decision making process" warranting setting aside of the contract.

It had rejected the pleas seeking lodging of an FIR and the court-monitored probe alleging irregularities in the Rs 58,000 crore deal, in which both the countries have entered into an inter-governmental agreement (IGA).

A bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi had dealt with "three broad areas of concern" raised in the petitions — the decision-making process, pricing and the choice of Indian offset partners (IOP) — and said there was no reason for intervention by the court on the "sensitive issue" of purchase of 36 jets.

It had said the Indian Air Force (IAF) needs advanced fighter jets as the country cannot afford to be "unprepared" or "under prepared" in a situation where adversaries have acquired fourth and fifth generation fighter aircraft, "of

which, we have none".

The apex court had said Thursday that it would consider hearing pleas seeking review of its December 14 verdict. It had considered the submission of Bhushan that his review plea and a separate application, seeking perjury prosecution of some government officials for "misleading" the court be listed urgently.

"We believe there are four petitions in the matter. One by Union of India... Some petitions (having defects) are lying with the registry," the bench said.

"The combination (of the judges) of bench will have to be changed. It is very difficult. We will do something for it," the bench had said.

The December verdict was delivered by the bench comprising the CJI and Justices S K Kaul and K M Joseph.

The two Justices are currently part of different bench combinations.

Vadra appears before ED for 5th time

Robert Vadra, brother-in-law of Congress President Rahul Gandhi, Friday appeared before the Enforcement Directorate (ED) for the fifth time in connection with a money-laundering case related to purchase of alleged illegal assets abroad, officials said.

Vadra reached the agency's office at Jammagar House in central Delhi shortly before 11 am, they said.

He has been grilled in this case four times in the past, the last being February 20.

Officials said the agency is confronting Vadra with documents and statements of other accused being investigated in the case and his statement is being recorded section 50 (powers of authorities regarding summons, production of documents and to give evidence) of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

During the last session, the businessman had told the investigating officer (IO) of the case that he was not well and hence, the recording of his statement was discontinued, the officials had said.

Vadra's appearance before the ED is related to a criminal complaint related to allegations of money laundering to purchase assets abroad, in an alleged illegal manner.

He has been questioned by the ED sleuths in this case for about 26 hours over four days of deposition earlier this month.

He has been asked by a Delhi court to cooperate in the probe being conducted by the central probe agency.

The ED case against Vadra relates to allegations of money laundering in the purchase of a London-based property, located at 12, Bryanston Square and worth 1.9 million pounds, which is allegedly owned by the businessman in a "benami" way. The agency had told the court that it had received information about various new properties in London that belonged to Vadra. These include two houses — one worth 5 million pounds and

the other valued at 4 million pounds -- six flats and other assets.

Vadra has denied the allegation of possessing illegal foreign assets and termed it a political witch-hunt against him. He has said he is being "hounded and harassed" to subvert political ends.

His first appearance before the ED earlier this month acquired political overtones after his wife Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, recently appointed

Congress general secretary in-charge of eastern Uttar Pradesh, accompanied him to the investigating agency's office and picked him up after questioning another time.

Vadra had also deposed before the ED twice in Jaipur in connection with another money-laundering case related to an alleged land scam in Bikaner. His mother Maureen too was questioned by the agency once during the same deposition.

Kozlowski told reporters that the Jaish-e-Mohammed had been listed by the EU as a terror outfit along with Lashkar-e-Tayyeba and several others.

"EU has an autonomous terrorist list. We have our own procedures independent of the UN," he said.

The UN Security Council had on Thursday condemned in the "strongest terms" the "heinous and cowardly" terror attack perpetrated by Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammed in Pulwama.

Kozlowski said India and the EU would strengthen cooperation in combating terrorism.

Assam hooch tragedy death toll rises to 25

At least 25 persons, including 15 women, have died and over 40 others have taken ill after consuming spurious liquor at a tea garden in Assam's Golaghat district, the police said on Friday.

The incident took place on Thursday night at the Salmora tea estate in Golaghat, 300 km from here.

"The death toll so far is 25, which includes 15 women and 10 men. While 18 people died at the Golaghat Civil Hospital, the rest breathed their last at the Jorhat Medical College and Hospital," said Rathin Bordoloi, Joint Director of Health, Golaghat district.

He said the people were brought to the hospitals with complaints of severe vomiting and chest pain. "We tried our best, but it was too late," he said.

"A total of 55 people have been referred to the Jorhat Medical College and Hospital for treatment. Seven of them have died while 48 others were still undergoing treatment," said the doctors at the Jorhat hospital.

ple consumed liquor in the tea estate on Thursday night after procuring the stock from a particular seller.

Several of them took ill immediately and many were not even taken to the hospital.

They also complained about a nexus between the police and the illegal liquor sellers. Assam Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal condemned the incident and sent a team to the district to take stock of the situation.

State Excise Minister Parimal Shuklabaidya has ordered a probe into the matter. "The State Government has suspended two excise officials after holding them responsible for the tragedy. We have also asked a four-member team, led by Additional Commissioner of Excise Department Sanjib Medhi, to probe the incident," said Shuklabaidya, adding that the probe committee has been asked to submit its report to the government within three days.

"Based on the inquiry report, stern measures will be taken across the state to plug the loopholes," Shuklabaidya said.

Stop cricket with Pak: Giriraj, it would be a mistake to do so: Tejashwi

Union Minister Giriraj Singh on Friday said India should not play cricket matches with Pakistan in the aftermath of the Pulwama terror attack which killed 40 CRPF personnel.

He advocated halting all types of exchanges with the neighbouring country, including sports, culture and trade. RJD's

Tejashwi Yadav, the leader of opposition in the Bihar assembly, however, said the dastardliness of the attack notwithstanding, scrapping of sporting ties and cultural exchanges would prove to be futile.

"There should be no cricket with Pakistan. We engage in no sports events with the country till it continues to aid and abet terror. Even families do not dine with each other when they

have a feud. So let us have no links with Pakistan, sporting, cultural or economic," Singh, a BJP hardliner, said in his Lok Sabha constituency of Nawada.

He also lauded Union minister Nitin Gadkari, who holds the Water Resources portfolio, for deciding to stop the flow of India's share of water to Pakistan from rivers under the Indus Waters Treaty. Demands have arisen for boycotting

Pakistan in international sports events, especially the cricket world cup scheduled to begin in May this year.

Sections of Bollywood have also expressed outrage. The All India Cine Workers Association has sought a total ban on Pakistani actors and artistes, and cancellation of their work visas, while actor Ajay Devgn had decided that his latest flick Total Dhamaal

will not be released in the neighbouring nation.

When asked about the growing clamour for discontinuance of such exchanges, Tejashwi Yadav said in Patna, "This should not happen. It is not going to achieve anything."

"The Pulwama terror attack deserves condemnation in the strongest possible words and the government must take whatever steps it deems proper on the

security front. But sports and culture must not be dragged into these issues," he said.

The younger son of RJD chief Lalu Prasad, who fancied a career in cricket before take a plunge into politics three years ago, said, "Players embody sportsman spirit. And hence sportspersons must be allowed to engage in their activity and bring happiness to the people."

We in CRPF identify ourselves as Indians...Caste and religion does not exist," the world's largest paramilitary force said through its chief spokesman's Twitter handle on Friday.

Peeved at a news report in a magazine that gave the caste break-up of the 44 personnel killed in the Pulwama attack, CRPF's chief spokesman and Deputy Inspector General (DIG) M Dhinakaran tweeted, "We in CRPF identify ourselves as Indians. Not more, not less. This pathetic divisiveness of caste, colour, and religion does-

n't exist in our blood."

He also tagged the news report saying it "should strictly refrain from insulting all the martyrs as they are not statistics for your demeaning and meaningless write-up".

The force had earlier issued advisories cautioning people against "fake pictures" being circulated online of body parts of the slain men and bogus messages being shared in the backdrop of harassment of Kashmiri students in various places in the country after the terror attack.

The over 3 lakh personnel force is the country's lead force for internal security duties.

Rahul attacks Modi over Pulwama attack, dubs him 'prime time minister'

In a scathing attack on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Congress president Rahul Gandhi on Friday said the "prime time minister" continued shooting for a film till even three hours after news of the Pulwama terror strike came in.

There was an ocean of pain in the country's hearts and in the homes of martyrs and he was smiling and doing a photo shoot in the waters, Rahul said on Twitter with #PhotoShootSarkar.

Adding to the controversy surrounding PM Modi's whereabouts after the Pulwama attack, Rahul tweeted four photographs of the Prime Minister in Jim Corbett Park.

Accompanying the photographs, Rahul wrote, "Even three hours after the martyrdom of 40 soldiers in Pulwama,

'prime time minister' was shooting for a film."

"There was a sea of grief in the hearts of Indians and homes of the soldiers, and he was smiling in his photoshoot at a lake," Rahul tweeted in Hindi.

Rahul went on to say, "A river of mourning in the hearts of the nation and the homes of the martyrs and he [PM Modi] was laughing and getting a photo shoot done next to a river."

This was a reference to photos that show the prime minister in a motorboat in the Jim Corbett national park.

Congress' chief spokesperson Randeep Surjewala, addressing a Press conference, also claimed that the Prime Minister continued to "have tea and samosas at seven o'clock in a PWD guest house when every single Indian household didn't eat food (that day)".

PM photo shoot: BJP slams Cong's claim

While asserting that "lies" need not to be responded to, the BJP on Friday dismissed Congress president Rahul Gandhi's claim that Prime Minister Narendra Modi attended a photo shoot allegedly hours after the Pulwama attack on February 14 as "fake news" and maintained that photographs displayed by the Opposition party were clicked in the morning ahead of the terror strikes.

"Rahul Ji, India is tired of your fake news. Stop sharing photos from that morning to shamelessly mislead the nation. Maybe you knew in advance of the attack but people of India got to know in the evening. Try a better stunt next time, where sacrifice of soldiers isn't involved," the BJP tweeted.

The BJP hit back after the Congress president called Modi "prime time minister" and said he continued shooting for a film in Uttarakhand even three hours after news of the Pulwama terror strike came in.

He also attacked photographs of Modi attending the photo-shoot and taking a boat ride. BJP spokesperson Sambit Patra dismissed as lies the Congress's claim that Prime Minister was "completely oblivious" to the terror strike or "insensitive" as he "continued" with his prior engagements

after the attack, and asserted that such lies need not be responded to.

Patra also attacked West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee and some other opposition leaders, claiming that they have spoken on the same lines as Pakistan has by questioning the timing of the attack. The neighbouring country has tried to link the attack with the upcoming Lok Sabha polls in India, he said, accusing the Trinamool Congress president of making similar comments.

He referred to the UN Security Council's strong condemnation of the terror attack and naming of Pakistan-based terror outfit Jaish-e-Mohammad by the global body to underscore the Modi Government's efforts to isolate Pakistan.

"On the one hand all countries are standing with India... Humanity is standing with us, some political parties for their petty politics are not standing with the country," Patra said, attacking the Congress.

Condemning media reports that had done a caste-wise analysis of the 40 CRPF personnel who were killed in the attack, Patra alleged that the Congress was behind it. "What kind of articles the Congress is getting printed," he asked, saying that Pakistan sees "casteism" and "Hindu-Muslim" issues as "faultlines" to weaken India.

Centre decides to keep in abeyance powers of arrest given to Assam Rifles

The Centre decided on Friday to keep in abeyance the special powers given to the Assam Rifles to arrest anyone and search a place without warrant in northeastern states of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland and Mizoram, officials said.

The Home Ministry will now revisit the issue with the concerned state governments, which apparently opposed the move to give sweeping powers to the paramilitary force.

It has been decided that the enabling notifications issued on February 19, giving powers to Assam Rifles to be kept in abeyance and the entire matter be revisited in consultation with the state governments concerned, a Home Ministry official said.

While giving the powers to the Assam Rifles, a Home Ministry notification had said, "An officer of the rank corresponding to that of the lowest rank of members of the Assam Rifles" has been given these powers under the Code of Criminal Procedure. Assam Rifles personnel will exercise these powers and discharge their duties "under sub-section (1) of section 41, sections 47, 48, 49, 51, 53, 54, 149, 150, 151 and 152 of the CrPC within the local limits of the area comprised within the border districts of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland and Mizoram", the notification had said.

Officials said on Friday that powers under CrPC were available to the Assam Rifles under the Assam Rifles Act, 1941. However, after coming into operation of the new Assam Rifles Act 2006, the issue of re-conferring these powers has remained under consideration since then.

Recently, the issue has acquired urgency for effective enforcement of Free Movement Regime on the Indo-Myanmar border (on the 16 km belt on either side).

Twitter Head of Public Policy to appear before Parl panel

Twitter Chief Executive Officer Jack Dorsey will not appear before the Parliamentary panel on IT on February 25, and instead the company is sending its Head of Public Policy Colin Crowell. The Parliamentary panel on Information Technology had summoned Twitter head Jack Dorsey to appear before it on February 25, and had refused to meet "junior officials" of the microblogging site during its meeting on February 11.

The meeting had been called against the backdrop of growing concerns about safeguarding citizens' data privacy and the possibility of social media platforms being used to interfere in the upcoming elections. After this meeting, the panel is expected to summon top executives of Facebook and WhatsApp on March 5 to discuss similar issues.

Sources in the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), however, said efforts were still on to have Dorsey attend the meeting. On February 11, the committee had refused to meet junior officials from Twitter's India office who were present at the meeting venue. During the meeting with Twitter, the panel wants to examine issues such as data privacy. It is also seeking to better understand the

company's business structure, including whether it is a technology company or a media house.

The panel passed an unanimous resolution that the micro-blogging website's CEO should make himself available to show the company's seriousness in safeguarding rights of Indian citizens online, they added.

As per the resolution, the panel would hear only the Twitter CEO or senior member of its global team "who has decision making authority regarding Twitter's operations in India," one of the sources had said, according to news agency Press Trust of India.

Even as it faces heat over allegations of political bias in the country, Twitter has maintained that it is committed to remain unbiased and that its product as well as policies is never based on political ideology.

The Government has been taking a strong view of misuse of social media platforms and is also proposing to amend IT rules to curb fake news and increase accountability of such apps.

Over the last few weeks, Facebook, Twitter and Google have promised to infuse more transparency into political advertisements on their platform, and announced a slew of measures as part of their election integrity efforts.

On Thursday, Twitter said it has

formed an internal, cross-functional group to lead "electoral integrity work" in India that will proactively support partner escalations, and identify potential threats from malicious actors.

Now file complaint with DoT against offensive messages received on WhatsApp

New Delhi: People can now file a complaint with the Department of Telecom (DoT) against offensive messages received on WhatsApp. The victim just needs to furnish a screenshot of the message along with the mobile number and e-mail to ccaddn-dot@nic.in.

"If anyone is receiving abusive/offensive/death threats/vulgar whatsapp messages, please send screen shots of the message along with the mobile numbers at ccaddn-dot@nic.in. We will take it up with the telecom operators and police heads for necessary action," DoT Controller Communications Ashish Joshi tweeted.

The move comes following many public figures, including journalists, complaining of receiving abusive and threatening messages.

Didi blames BJP again for 'allowing' Pulwama

Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee once again blamed the Narendra Modi Government for allowing the Pulwama attack to take place and attacked the BJP for trying to divide the electorate by spreading hatred.

The Chief Minister who was speaking at a mass gathering at Tarakeswar in Hooghly district on Friday accused the Centre of neglecting the security issue that allowed the terrorists to launch one of the most dreaded attacks on the Indian security forces in the history of free India.

Wondering as to "what the Government was doing before the attack" and "why they did not take adequate measures" despite having prior reports Banerjee said "they were all doing politics and nothing else over the issue."

Accusing the BJP and the RSS of fomenting communal tension in Bengal by spreading rumors Banerjee said, "I will do everything for the people but I will never allow riots to take place in our State," adding, how a band of half-literate people were feigning as champions of Hindu religion in the garb of saffron clothes.

"They have no sense of the Hindu ethos, no knowledge of the true Hindu scriptures. They



only know how to fan riots by spreading rumors. But I will not allow them to do so in Bengal," she said complaining how the agents of the RSS and BJP were spreading rumor of child-lifters in parts of the State.

"As the Chief Minister I have specific information that they have let loose burqa-clad people in the market to pass off as child-lifters. Then they are spreading rumors about these child-lifters so as to incite people and create a communal disharmony," Banerjee said referring to the recent spate of mass thrashing of alleged child-lifters in parts of Bengal.

Attacking the BJP Government for creating a mass hysteria to turn the public attention from its failed promises

Banerjee asked, "What happened to the promise that you (Modi) made to the people of bringing back black money from abroad and depositing Rs 15 lakh in each account."

The Hindu ethos was against violence she said asking people to remain alert against hate-rumors. "Even I am a Hindu. Even we have seen pujas in our houses since we were children but our parents never taught to hate other religions," she said asking "who are these people to dictate food habits among others."

Even the "monks of Ramakrishna Mission and Bharat Sevashram Sangha wear saffron attire but they never attack others' religions because they like true Hindus believe in the unity of religions," she said. In the eight years of TMC rule "not a single temple, mosque or church was touched in Bengal," she said reminding how her government helped in renovating temples in the State, unlike the BJP which was pre-occupied with religious divide.

Accusing the Centre of playing political game with partially State-funded health schemes like Ayushman Bharat Banerjee said, "We don't need Centre's dole... Ayushman Bharat letters which come with pictures (of political parties) will not run in Bengal," reminding half of the central health scheme was funded by the State Government.

Women on top in Mamata's health scheme

In a revolutionary first step that could go a distance in restoring women's pride in the Indian family system, Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Friday unfolded a family health scheme that would primarily revolve around the main woman of the family.

In what she called a card issued in the name of the "woman head of the family" the newly devised smart health card would take care of health expenses of up to Rs 5 lakh in a given family. The card issued to the woman would take care not only of her marital family but also of her biological parents, she said.

"This is a great step forward towards women's empowerment," Banerjee said, adding the person who would be issued the card would be considered as the head of the family and "it would not only take care of her marital family but also of her parents as often such parents become helpless in their old age."

Listing how her Government's achievements have been acknowledged internationally Banerjee said the Utkarsh Bangla scheme like the earlier Kanyashree plan had won UN awards. On social welfare she said how "about 8 crore people of the State get Rs 2 per kg rice" and her Government had waived the taxes on farm land.

Post-Pulwama attack: Kashmiri scribe beaten up in Pune, 3 held

In a second unsavoury incident of backlash after last week's Pulwama terror attack, a journalist from Kashmir was beaten up by some unknown persons in Pune, even as three Yuv Sena office bearers were arrested by the local police at Yavatmal in eastern Maharashtra on Friday in connection with Wednesday's assault on five Kashmiri students.

Zibran Nazeer, a copy editor working with a national English newspaper published from Pune, was roughed up by some unidentified persons. The Pune police have not yet identified the culprits behind the incident.

The Yavatmal police, meanwhile, arrested three Yuv Sena office bearers, including the one Ajinkya Motke, for allegedly beating up four Kashmiri students in Waghapur Road area of the eastern Maharashtra town.

On its part, the Shiv Sena has expelled from the party the Yuva Sena's office-bearers involved in the assault incident. In tweets put out on Friday, Yuva Sena president Aditya Thackeray said, "There was an unfortunate incident yest in Yavatmal, with some students of Jammu & Kashmir. The @ShivSena had issued a press note yesterday itself which hasn't been printed today, may be to further sensationalise the issue or defame us, while ignoring our disciplinary action"

"As of last evening, the Party has sacked those involved in the act. J&K is a part of India and no Indian, or for that matter, nobody should face the brunt of anger that is towards terrorism. We understand the angst but it must be against terror, not innocent people," Aditya added.

In all five Kashmiri students — identified as Umar Nazeer Ganai, Umar Rashid Dar, Tajimullah Ali, Owais Mushtaq and Amir Mulad — humiliated, beaten up and forced by Yuv Sena activists to raise slogans like "Vande Mataram", "Hindustan zindabad" and "Bharatmata ki Jai" at Yavatmal on Wednesday night.

The victim students were from Dayabhai Patel College of Physical Education. The Yuv Sena activists accosted them near their rented homes in Waghapur Road area of the town and physically harassed them as a mark of "protest" against the Pulwama terror strike in which 44 CRPF jawans were killed. Two of the jawans from the neighbouring Buldhana district were among those killed in the Pulwama attack.

A clip of video footage shot by the Yuv Sena activists themselves went viral on social media on Thursday. The footage showed a local Yuv Sena leader beating the Kashmiri students and asking them questions like to from where they were, as to why they had come to Yavatmal and whether they were linked with terrorists. "What is your name? Why have you come here? You should not come here... What connection do you have with the terrorists there?... You relatives are killing our jawans there. Why have you come here? How many students are here like you in Yavatmal?"

The replies from a student like "I have to come to study here... I am the son of a doctor. I have not been to Kashmir for the last one and a half years... There are 15 to 20 Kashmiri students in Yavatmal (the Yuv Sena leader tells the student: Tell them not to be here)," would not satisfy the Yuv Sena leader who continued to beat him and other students up.

All roads in Chennai lead to Vijayakanth

Vijayakanth, convalescing at his house in Chennai suburb has become the most sought after person in Tamil Nadu politics. MK Stalin, president of the DMK and Tamil film's all time great Rajinikanth called on the ailing actor at his residence on Friday as political alliance formation in the State for the Lok Sabha election reached a feverish pitch.

Vijayakanth, founder of the DMDK has not opened his mind to the media. But news trickling out of his Virugambakkam residence through emissaries of the AIADMK, the DMK and the BJP who met him to court him to their fronts said that the actor is adamant that he should get at least seven seats and a Rajya Sabha seat from the AIADMK. This is what the AIADMK allocated to the PMK on Tuesday to ensure the Vanniyaar dominated party stays with the front led by the ruling dispensation in Tamil Nadu.

Stalin who called on

Vijayakanth told reporters that there was no politics in his visit to the actor's residence. "We are good friends for the last 35 years and imy visit was to enquire about the health of Vijayakanth," said Stalin after the meet.

As usual grapevines in Chennai worked overtime and came out with stories claiming that Rajinikanth's visit was as an emissary of the BJP and he had requested Vijayakanth to join the AIADMK-led front.

"There is not a drop of politics in my visit to Vijayakanth's house," said Rajinikanth. Sources close to the DMDK first family (which include Premalatha Vijayakanth and her brother T S Sudhhas) said that the actor has demanded seven Lok Sabha seats and would not settle for anything less. "He may come round and join the front which pays him the pound of flesh he demands. This could be Lok Sabha seats or in kind" said the source.

Priyanka rejects proposal to replace Babbar

Congress general secretary in charge of UP east, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, has rejected a proposal to replace UPCC chief Raj Babbar, saying he will continue till the Lok Sabha polls are over.

Sources in the party said that Priyanka also shot down a proposal for appointing another party chief to oversee east UP.

At a meeting convened to discuss Lok Sabha elections at Congress War Room at 15, Gurudwara Rakabganj Road in New Delhi on Thursday, Priyanka along with Congress general secretary in charge of UP west, Jyotiraditya Scindia, and UP Congress chief Raj Babbar sat down to thrash out strategies for the upcoming polls.

After hectic deliberations, the meeting ended around Thursday midnight.

The discussion also veered around a possible replacement of Babbar, but it was set aside as little time was left for the general elections.

The idea of having two state chiefs for Uttar Pradesh was also brushed aside.

The sources said that Congress workers, during their discussions with Priyanka, had appreciated Babbar's role as an influential campaigner but were critical of his ability to manage the organisation.

UP ATS arrests 2 suspected JeM ultras in Deoband

Two suspects with alleged links with terror outfit Jaish-e-Mohammad were arrested from Deoband, in Saharanpur in a swoop by an Anti-Terrorist Squad led by IG Aseem Arun in the intervening night of Thursday-Friday. Posing as students without taking admission anywhere, the duo were staying in Deoband and were engaged in recruiting new faces for their organisation.

Chats linked to jihad, videos, pictures linked with JeM and two 30 calibre pistols and 30 cartridges were also recovered from their possession.

DGP OP Singh told the media in Lucknow on Friday that the UP ATS had arrested Shahnawaz Ahmad Teli of Kulgam district and Aquib Ahmad Malik from Pulwama district of Jammu and Kashmir and they were aged between 20 and 25 years.

Singh said the Jammu and Kashmir Police was being contacted to get more inputs about the arrested duo. He also said that information about their period of stay in Deoband was also being collected.

"The ATS got a tip-off about the two from an alert student after which a probe was initiated. IG (ATS) Aseem Arun reached Saharanpur to verify the credentials of the youths, who posed as students. After days of surveillance, both were arrested.

Asked whether the two were involved in the recent Pulwama terror attack, the DGP said, "It is difficult to tell whether they came here before the terror attack or after that. A probe is on to ascertain that."

"Both are being grilled about their arrival in the state from Kashmir, how many other members are involved, was anyone recruited by them for JeM, where did the funding come from, what was its quantum and what was their target after recruitment," the DGP said.

Starve terror funding

While the UNSC has named JeM in its resolution, it should follow up by curtailing funds to Pakistan-based terror outfits

Given that China has always obliged its puppet state of Pakistan in the past and blocked any anti-terror resolution against groups that use the territory of India's western neighbour to launch a constant stream of small attacks on our country, it was telling that even it was forced into approving the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) resolution. With trade talks with the United States stalled and China's economy feeling the heat due to the Trump Administration's talks on that front, China finally gave up its blatant hypocrisy and approved this resolution. One must not forget that despite China's covert support for Islamist terrorists in Pakistan, that country has been brutalising its Islamic minority in its north-west region. The Uighurs in particular have been incarcerated in mass camps, which according to scant reports from that region, are akin to Nazi Germany's concentration camps. Unfortunately, JeM chief, Masood Azhar, while able to indoctrinate youths into killing themselves, does not quite comprehend the concept of irony of being protected by a country whose policy towards his Muslim brethren, whom he claims to be fighting for, is so frighteningly barbaric.

But even if China condemns the attack on Indian paramilitary forces, albeit indirectly through a UNSC resolution, it will not change Pakistan's behaviour. As long as funds continue to flow into Pakistan from Saudi Arabia, China and even Western powers, which are desperate for peace in Afghanistan, can do little. The Pakistani meddling has left its western neighbour poverty-stricken and under-developed yet flush with weapons. The US and the European Union through their central banks must do more to block the routes of terror fundings. The United States Treasury Department, for example, claims jurisdiction whenever the US dollar is used in bribes or terror and following the 9/11 attacks has done a lot to clean out the global banking system of terror funding and money laundering. Yet, much more needs to be done to clean up the system. In India as well, despite digitisation and the impact of demonetisation, money-laundering continues to grease the wheels of the terrorist machine in Kashmir. It is likely that the authorities are aware of how the system works, often through seemingly legitimate businesses. They have to crack down on these.

While cutting the money machine will not completely stop terrorism in the Valley, it can dramatically aid the situation because indoctrination only goes so far. Without money, terror activities also dry up. This is similar to the methods used by the Israelis in combating terror. While the Government has acted against wanton sources of foreign money coming into India, which earlier had little or no accountability, it has dawdled in cracking down on those who fund Kashmiri separatists. And this has to stop now.

Erring Governor

The BJP has failed in fulfilling its Constitutional duties by not acting against Tathagata Roy's anti-Kashmiri remarks



It has almost become routine now for the nation to expect directives from the Supreme Court on what should have been an easy enough executive function of the State, to protect the rights of its citizens, majority or minority. So though the Home Ministry issued a directive to secure Kashmiris following the hitbacks of rage and hate post-Pulwama, the failure of implementing it was evident from a series of attacks and slurs on Kashmiri students and traders across the country. One that led to a PIL and the top court telling the government how it is done. It directed chief secretaries and DGPs of 11 States, where the hate-mongering was severe, to take "prompt" action to prevent incidents of threat, assault and social boycott of Kashmiris and specifically assigned police officers, who were earlier appointed as nodal officers to deal with incidents of mob lynching, to look after affected Kashmiris.

The question is whether the current NDA government could not have done this on its own? The question also is if the government, seeking a second term in general elections just weeks away, doesn't want to be seen as *sabka saath*? Or does it want to pander to the majoritarian discourse and play up the hyper-nationalist narrative following the biggest terrorist attack in the Valley? Everybody is angry about this gross brutality but to ostracise an entire community of people just because it had been blighted by some indoctrinated militants is to simplify the problem to suit a certain narrative than deal with the complexities of it. Clearly, the government of the day has not helped douse inflamed passions or emotions by playing down the extent of hate crimes, even by way of an appeal by one of the Ministers. What is inexcusable is its staunch refusal to upbraid the Meghalaya Governor Tathagata Roy, who has been fanning hatred by calling for a boycott of Kashmiri goods and people on his social media handle, implicitly turning Indians *versus* Indians though he believes Kashmiris are not worth being called that. Neither has the top leadership of the BJP asked him to issue an apology or delete his tweet, except distancing itself from his remarks. Strangely, there is no talk of recalling the Governor for acting contrary to his Constitutional duties. And while President Ram Nath Kovind is bound to act on the advice of his Council of Ministers, fact is there is no statement or action by his office to condemn the fissiparous comments. For a chair that was once held by luminaries, at least there could have been a moral censure, displeasure or conscience call. That he is allowed to make in keeping with the spirit of the Constitution. By allowing the Meghalaya Governor to go scot free despite his abusive statements, he too would be seen as failing in executing his constitutional duties. Roy's comments clearly fall within the ambit of the legal principle of "compelling reasons" to initiate action against him for going against the spirit embedded in our Preamble and clearly violating the principles of liberty, equality, fraternity and justice. Can we afford to alienate Kashmiris further when counter-insurgency should be matched by a counter-social engagement? Evacuating them from other Indian states, where they have gone to better their lives away from militancy through education and jobs, is like pouring cold water on mainstreaming efforts. By failing to act against Roy, the government seems to be giving a tacit approval to sick polarisation attempts simply because they can cause an emotional wave during the elections. The BJP may want to keep him as a party member but he sure should not be Governor anymore.

Tough terms of friendship

Given Saudi Arabia's own priorities and strategic roadmap imperatives, Pakistan will remain a preferred ally as long as it does not harm Saudi interests directly

Saudi Crown Prince Mohammad-bin Salman (MbS) is touring the three most important capitals beyond Washington, DC, in his post-Khashoggi phase. The Western capitals were ultimately not amused by MbS' ingrained feudal instincts in carrying out the rash internal purge, *l'affaire* Khashoggi and other unwarranted military interventions, after the initial hoopla surrounding the ostensible modernisation drive by the "real power behind the throne." His initially feted socio-economic promises of "Vision 2030" and steps to liberalise and reform the society were soon undone by reports of increased human rights violations and clumsy interventions in Syria, Yemen and Qatar as also a purported kidnapping of the Lebanese Prime Minister!

However, the crude and brutal assassination of Saudi dissenter Jamal Khashoggi, attributed directly to the recklessness of the young Prince himself, was the last straw for the Western nations in condemning MbS openly. His style of management by intimidation, coercion and "buying out" became obvious as indeed his deep-rooted insecurities and ambition that saw him systematically "neutralise" all opposition.

Recent international opprobrium has led to heightened insecurities and the Saudis have, therefore, made a deliberate outreach towards the alternative global platform of the East as they hope to enhance their economic and geo-political stability with two of their top three export markets, namely China, the biggest, and India, the third biggest revenue generator. However, his pit-stop at Islamabad was, perhaps, the most significant for it addressed the perennial and foremost fear in the minds of the Saudi Royal family — regime change.

Historically, Saudi Arabia's closest Muslim ally, Pakistan has been the trusted go-to nation for managing all internal and external threats to the vulnerable House of Saud. The role of the Pakistan Army's Special Services Group (SSG) in overcoming the seizure of the Grand Mosque at Mecca in 1979 typified both the sort of domestic challenges that beset the rule of the Saud family as indeed the faith reposed on Pakistani soldiers.

In the 1970s and 1980s, up to 20,000 Pakistani soldiers were said to be deployed within Saudi Arabia to protect its sensitive spots. With the sixth largest military in the world, reasonable combat-exposure and even nuclear capabilities on Pakistan's side, the Saudi-Pakistan relationship became more symbiotic, logical and mutually-gratifying.

Custodianship of the two holiest mosques and as the ready "investor" in all domestic urgencies of Pakistan led a former Pakistani Ambassador to Saudi Arabia



to famously state that the security of Saudi Arabia was a "personal matter." It is often claimed that the Saudis had even secretly funded the Pakistani nuclear programme as it allowed them the plausible option of deniability as also ensured the requisite protection *via* Pakistan in the face of growing threats from its sectarian-nemeses, Iran and also states like Saddam's Iraq and Israel.

The Saudi funding of the Pakistan-controlled Afghan *mujahideen* in the 1980s and 1990s is a matter of recorded fact. Today, a leaner Pakistani contingent in the form of "advisors," trainers and even combat soldiers, ensures the continuity of this crucial comfort-factor for both nations. Deteriorating relationship with the US and parallel growing proximity of both nations with the alternate power centre of China is yet another matter of strategic option and convergence.

The influence that the Saudis can wield on the Pakistani state and also its powerful military was in full display when the Saudi brokered release and exit for the

deposed Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif in the 1999 military coup by the then Pakistani General, Pervez Musharraf.

Later, the Saudis were able to rope in the just-retired Pakistani Chief of Army, General Raheel Sharif, to head the controversial 41-nation Islamic Military Counter Terrorism Alliance (IMCTA), based out of Riyadh — without General Raheel Sharif completing the mandatory two-year "cool-off" period required before accepting any international assignment.

There was a minor bump in the relationship with Pakistan shying away from committing its military forces in Saudi Arabia's misguided war in Yemen, owing to sectarian implications within the tinderbox of Pakistan itself. Soon, security desperation for the Saudis and the dire economic desperation for Pakistanis ensured that the two nations perpetuate and strengthen the umbilical cord of *quid pro quo*.

Expectedly, Pakistan pulled out all stops to roll out the red carpet for MbS and he did not disappoint his hosts with a slew

of \$20 billion investments for cash-strapped Pakistanis. More pertinently, the loaded statement, suggesting the dissuasion of "politicising the UN listing regime," when India was in the midst of making international efforts to name and shame Jaish-e-Mohammad's Masood Azhar, did not go unnoticed in New Delhi. Maturity, gravitas and nuanced diplomacy is not a known MbS strength, and particularly at this moment of vulnerability for himself, he would be driven by the urge to buy out Pakistani guarantees for securing the Kingdom's worst nightmare — regime change.

No other country of the 41 nation IMCTA grouping has either the quantity or quality of readily-deployable military or is as deeply indebted to Saudi Arabia for its own economic survival (2.5 million Pakistani work in Saudi Arabia) as the Pakistanis — affording a win-win solution for both by deepening ties. Imran Khan's charm offensives elicited a candid and spontaneous, "Consider me Pakistan's Ambassador to Saudi Arabia," from MbS.

Therefore, given Saudi Arabia's own priorities and

strategic roadmap imperatives, Pakistan will remain a preferred ally that will always benefit from a deliberate overlook for any of its misdemeanours as long as they do not harm Saudi Arabian interests directly.

India shares common ground with Saudi Arabia on religious extremism (finally) and on organisations like the Islamic State (IS) or Al Qaeda — though a similar aversion and clamp-down on the subcontinental extremist bodies like the Jaish-e-Mohammad or even the Pakistan-sponsored Taliban, may not be as forthcoming.

On the contrary, equity with the likes of the Afghan Taliban may actually give Saudi Arabia counter-leverage against the US in its battle of wits. Diminishing the Pakistani establishment, especially its military, would be perceived to be extremely counter-productive to Saudi interests, as it risks portents of regime-change in Saudi Arabia — a nightmare that Pakistan willy-nilly guarantees against.

War beyond borders

India is not the only country facing terrorism. It has to, therefore, ensure a global alliance to break the backbone of terror and its illicit funding

The Pulwama terror attack that claimed the lives of 40 Indian soldiers has caused remorse and frenzy across the country to take revenge. There has been a cry to teach Pakistan a lesson. Many have even advocated for a war. Indians are hurt but howsoever one may wish, the solution is not easy. India has military preparedness but war will be expensive, and this not just in monetary terms. The sub-continent is passing through severe uncertainty as its neighbours — Afghanistan and China — change tack every now and then. This, combined with the changing situation in Afghanistan, where the US is in a hurry to withdraw its troops, and the Taliban's muscle-flexing, have made matters worse. Russia and Iran are not shy of striking a deal with the Taliban. All of this apart, big money plays a crucial role. It is not just the nation states that are pouring funds. In fact, they, including the US, are having trouble arranging for it. India is just next to a troubled Western Asia sired by the Islamic State (IS).

The IS war is being fought not for a "holy cause of jihad." Terror is a complex mix of arms-drug peddlers, cyber frauds, human traffickers and other hegemonists. School girls from Europe to West Asia are used in the sex trade. This generates illicit funds. Will the Taliban take control of Afghanistan, where India has invested huge sums of money, as also in diplomacy, with the US' withdrawal? It may be seen as yet another American failure after its loss in Vietnam, Somalia, Iraq and Syria. Since 2001, after spending billions, the US controls not even half of Afghanistan. Afghan soldiers and civilian casualties are heavy. Saudi Arabia, Qatar and the UAE are working out the face-saver for the US' withdrawal. They are also pressurising Pakistan to help as also providing financial aid to boost its forex reserves that are as low as \$ 6 billion. Saudi Arabia has given \$32 billion aid to Islamabad.

Conflict is rising in northern borders of Pakistan. Even Iran lost 28 soldiers in a blast on its borders with Pakistan on February 12. Frenzy is ripe there too. The country vowed retribution. The sub-continent is on a tinder box but war is too complex an affair. Astute diplomacy is needed to save India's economic assistance and friends in Afghanistan and Iran. The Taliban's resurgence is a problem for Islamabad. It fears losing its might to it. Moreover, tribal regions on Pakistan's borders are on ferment with sub-nationalism. Slight change in equilibrium would cause major problems for India and other states. The Pakistani Government is not in full control. The diplomatic question is: Who do you fight? Pakistan? Or in case of a war, Taliban, Jaish-e-Mohammad and other riff-raff elements? The situation today is more complex than in 1971, when Bangladesh was created despite radicalisation even at that time. There are many non-state actors.

Today, it's not an issue of an Islamic bomb on India. It is managing within the country and outside in multi-dimensions and directions. An aggressive diplomacy, lobbying, negotiations and operations need huge investment as also manpower. Conflict with Pakistan cost three per cent of India's GDP, according to Indian think-tank, Strategic Foresight Group, in 2004. India lost 3,843 soldiers in 1971 and captured 93,000 soldiers. Almost a million people in India were refugees. It had bled the economy then. The post-1971 war costs were higher. It had caused over 13 per cent inflation and severe unrest. The imposition of internal emergency was another fall-out. The proxy war since 1990 has claimed more casualties and economic cost — be it in Kashmir, the Kargil conflict of 1999, the Parliament attack in 2001, the 2008 Mumbai attack or the subsequent several other blasts and raids. Military and civilian casualties are more than it was in full-fledged wars in 1965 and 1971.

It is estimated that since December 2001, every year, almost \$600 million is spent to protect the western border. Pakistan's spending is estimated to be a little less but it is higher in percentage terms for its GDP and geographical area. The Federation of Indian Chambers for Commerce and Industry estimated a huge business cost to the ongoing Indo-Pak conflict and trade volume is small. In other words, denying MFN status to Pakistan would have little economic impact.

So what does Pakistan gain? A conflict with India has seen huge economic gains in assistance from West Asia, the US and the West. The US, despite the World Trade Tower attack, considered Pakistan a strategic ally and gave Musharraf enormous aid. Even the current President Donald Trump is doing it today. India-baiting is survival technique for the artificial state. For us, apart from financial and political cost, there is human misery. Certain powers want the rogue state to survive as they have business, territorial and other interests. India has to chart out a course. A war may not be easy but breaking the tentacles of those who lead to war is a necessity. What have we done post-Pulwama? India has to re-strategise and ensure global alliance to break the backbone of terror and its illicit funding.

Dravidian pride at stake

With the Congress and the BJP stitching alliances with DMK and AIADMK respectively, some interesting action awaits Tamil Nadu with both regional parties having to battle contradictions

Well, Tamil Nadu is ready for the quinquennial Lok Sabha election which may take place in the month of April. With the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) and the Congress announcing the formalisation of their alliance to fight the Lok Sabha election together, the line-up in the State is ready. The *mahagathbandhan* in the Dravidian land would be led by MK Stalin with the Congress, the Left, the Marumalarchi Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (MDMK), the Viduthalai Chiruthaigal Katchi (VCK) and the Islamist parties riding piggyback on the shoulders of the DMK. Meanwhile, the ruling All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK) has announced the mega alliance that features the Vanniyaar-dominated Pattali Makkal Katchi (PMK) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). The AIADMK is in talks with the Desiya Murpokku Dravida Kazhagam (DMDK), led by former film star Vijayakanth and the Tamil Maanila Congress of GK Vasan, son of former Congress strongman, GK Moopnar.

Since all constituents in the DMK-led front are themselves struggling to stay afloat, they would be happy with whatever the DMK throws at them. The VCK, a fringe outfit led by Thol Thirumavalavan, has been out in the political wilderness since 2009. It has no representation in the Tamil Nadu Assembly since 2011 and its leaders have been losing successively since 2009. The communists are also facing uncertainty in the State after they failed to win at least a single seat either in the Lok Sabha or in the Assembly since 2014. But they claim that they are the ones who determine the future of Tamil Nadu.

Till the AIADMK succeeded in making deals with the PMK and the BJP, by allocating seven and five seats to them respectively, it was widely believed that the DMK was in for a big win in the Lok Sabha election. The AIADMK has been fretting and floundering since the passing away of party supremo, J Jayalalithaa, in December 2016. The group led by Sasikala (former aide of Jayalalithaa), popularly known as the 'Mannargudi Mafia' had walked away with one faction of the party while the official faction led by Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami looked vulnerable, fragile and weak. While Sasikala had to surrender to the Parappana Agrahara Central Prison in Bengaluru in February 2017, following a Supreme Court order which quashed the Karnataka High Court's verdict that had acquitted Jayalalithaa, Ilavarasi and VN Sudhakaran in the disproportionate asset case, TTV Dinakaran, Sasikala's nephew, emerged as the *de facto* leader of the AIADMK, much to the anguish of the cadre.

But within months, the Mannargudi clan was eased out of the AIADMK and Chief Minister Palaniswami slowly but steadily started taking control of the party and the Government. Though he is yet to emerge as a charismatic leader who could match the prowess of Amma (as Jayalalithaa is addressed by the cadre), Palaniswami has proved that he is not a pushover. As he completed two years in office on February 17, the small-time politician from the Edappadi village in Salem has tightened his grip over the party and Government apparatus.

Since day one of his swearing in as the Chief Minister, Palaniswami was under attack by Stalin, the Leader of the Opposition. The Income Tax and



Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) raids on the offices and residences of Health Minister C Vijaya Baskar and his department heads, the *gukha* scam, which led to CBI raids in the houses of top police officers in the State and the vigilance probe into the civil contracts given by the AIADMK Government to a cartel of contractors, successively added to the worries of the Chief Minister. Stalin had been claiming that the Government would not last for more than a month.

The DMK chief's agony can be understood. The party has been out of the corridors of power in Chennai since 2011 and out of the Delhi power circle since 2013. It is a struggle for survival for him and his party. The 2014 Lok Sabha election saw a political tsunami with Jayalalithaa devastating the DMK in all 39 constituencies in Tamil Nadu. Interestingly, the Congress and the DMK fought the election separately with the latter forfeiting its security deposits in all constituencies except Kanyakumari, where the party finished second to the BJP. The DMK is facing a series of disadvantages from within as well as outside. The major issue hanging like a sword of Damocles over Stalin's head is his own elder brother, MK Alagiri. Though Alagiri has been expelled from the DMK following the machinations of Stalin, the Madurai-based son of late M Karunanidhi is a force to reckon with in many pockets of Tamil Nadu. The media in the State has never been a fan of the blunt-talking Alagiri. If one has to know the influence wielded by Alagiri, all one has to do is to check the results of the 2001 Assembly election, which the DMK was widely believed to have won easily. Alagiri is a veteran expert in tilting the scales of electoral battles. Dayanidhi Maran and Kalanithi Maran, the grand nephews of late Karunanidhi, are running from court to court to derail the trial in the illegal telephone exchange case in which the brothers are the prime accused.

Then there are inherent problems. The DMK itself is a secessionist party as Stalin had declared in March 2018 that the idea of a separate Dravida nation was still alive in the constitution of the party.

The presence of the Congress in the DMK camp itself is a contradiction because the latter is for the immediate release of all the seven assassins undergoing life imprisonment in the 1991 assassination of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi. The other constituents in the DMK front have made it known that they would fight for the release of the seven assassins, leaving the Congress flabbergasted.

The AIADMK front, too, has contradictions and weaknesses. The PMK is in the forefront, fighting for exempting Tamil Nadu from NEET. M Thambi Durai of the AIADMK, who is the deputy speaker of the Lok Sabha, was against any kind of alliance with the BJP, which he describes as a communal party. Anwar Raajhaa, the Muslim face of the AIADMK, has declared that he would fight against the triple *talaq* Bill till his last breath. It may sound interesting but the truth remains that Anbumani Ramadoss, the chief ministerial candidate of the PMK, had submitted a massive memorandum to Governor Banwarilal Purohit, listing nearly 30 corruption charges against the AIADMK Government. But the PMK and the AIADMK are strong alliance partners now.

Then there are issues like education. Tamil Nadu is the only State in the country which does not have a single Navodaya Vidyalaya, a public school concept introduced by the Rajiv Gandhi Government in 1986. Reason? Dravidian parties are against teaching of Hindi and Sanskrit in schools. What has happened is that students in Tamil Nadu have fallen behind in the standard of education because the State-level school syllabus is poor, compared to the quality of education in other standards. The children of Tamil chauvinist politicians learn Hindi and English in high-end schools. The non-teaching of Hindi in the State has created a sense of alienation in the minds of the people.

The split in the party and the absence of a powerful leader like Jayalalithaa has made the AIADMK vulnerable. TTV Dinakaran hopes that the Thevar community would vote for him, which would further weaken the AIADMK. But Palaniswami, who

hails from the Vellala Gounder community, is confident that his brethren in south and south-west Tamil Nadu would stand with him because he is the first Chief Minister from this community. The inclusion of PMK was also not without reason. The Vanniyaars are an influential lot in the districts — ranging from Tiruvallur to Kanchipuram, Vellore to Tiruvannamalai and from Villupuram to Cuddalore. Though the PMK and the DMDK failed to win at least a single seat in the 2016 Assembly election, results show that they retained their vote percentage in the State, which fluctuates between five per cent to six per cent. The caste factor plays an important role in Tamil Nadu despite claims made by the Dravidians that theirs is a casteless society. The AIADMK was staging a 'coup' when it signed the deal with the PMK.

The DMK front looks formidable on paper, like the Brazilian team for the 2018 World Cup Football Championship. Stalin reminds one of Neymar, a paper tiger. The DMK president is a pale shadow of his late father Karunanidhi. Add to this the Periarites and Dravidian intelligentsia of Chennai, which has spread the 'news' that the DMK front would win all the 39 seats from the State. They also spread the news that the BJP high command was threatening the AIADMK for 20 seats. The allocation of five seats by the AIADMK, which was accepted by the BJP, demolishes a part of the falsehood spread by media and intelligentsia.

It is true that the AIADMK has failed in countering the propaganda by Dravidians. But by Tuesday, when the AIADMK-BJP-PMK alliance was announced, it had become clear that the DMK would not have a smooth sailing in the bout. The AIADMK looked like a party which would be outplayed by the DMK with a tennis score (40-0). But not any more. There is some interesting action in store as the AIADMK, the DMK and Dinakaran take to the field. To add to the glamour, there is Kamal Haasan, who thinks he is the greatest of all politicians. Let the game begin!

Revisiting the Iranian revolution

Had the post-modernists bothered to look beneath the meta-narratives of 20th century revolutions, they would not have come up with a naïve account

written by the late professor of politics Sepehr Zabih. Writing just three years after the revolution, Zabih said that the revolution was driven by a wide coalition of anti-Shah forces, which included democrats, liberals, secular-nationalists, communists, socialists and "Islamists." According to Zabih, after the Shah dictatorship collapsed in January 1979, there was a "power grab" among various groups that worked in unison during the revolution.

However, some historians continued to explain the revolution as "Islamic." While dealing with the immediate pre-revolution scenario, however, even they agree that multiple forces, advocating a diverse range of ideologies, were involved during the upheaval. They agree upon the point that Iran's senior religious leader Ayatollah Khomeini was the most widely accepted figure of authority during the revolution — even by those who hold the claim that the clergy hijacked the revolution.

But foreign affairs expert Robin Wright in her book *The Last Great Revolution* wrote that even though many secular, liberal and even some Leftist forces agreed to accept

Khomeini as the revolution's central figure, they did so to keep the movement intact and, more so, because they believed Khomeini did not have any overt political ambitions.

Just before leaving for Tehran from Paris (where he had been in exile) Khomeini told the French daily, *Le Monde*, that it was not his intent to make religious leaders run the Government. What's more, as Bowden notes in his 2006 book, *Guests of the Ayatollah*, on his return to Iran after the Shah's fall, the Ayatollah retired to his home in Qom after agreeing to form an interim set-up of "secular technocrats" led by the anti-Shah "liberal-democrat" Mehdi Bazargan.

According to Wright, just a year after the revolution, Khomeini decreed that no cleric was allowed to run in Iran's first post-revolution elections in 1980, even though he had already declared Iran to be an Islamic republic. A centre-right liberal, Syed Banisadar, won the election, attracting 75.6 per cent of the popular vote.

The candidate of the Islamic Republican Party, which was pushing for an entirely theocratic set-up, bagged just 3.35 per cent. But by 1981,

Khomeini was being hassled by the clerics to dismiss Banisadar "because he was acting against the clergy." In June 1981, after realising that he had lost Khomeini's backing, Banisadar managed to escape abroad.

Political scientist John Limbert, in his book, *Iran: At War With History*, wrote that Iran was ravaged by violence between various groups that had taken part in the revolution. After Banisadar's escape, the nationalist and liberal groups were systematically eliminated by pro-Khomeini Islamic militias. The Leftist outfits picked up arms to push back the influence of the clerics. But after ordering a purge in Iran's universities, which had been hotbeds of Leftist student agitation during the revolution, the emerging Islamic regime went all out against the Leftists. By December 1983, the pro-Khomeini Islamic Republican Party had managed to grab absolute power and turn Iran into a theocracy. The irony of it all is that many clerics were some of the last to join the movement against the Shah.

One important commentator of the revolution who called it Islamic was the famous post-modernist

French philosopher Michel Foucault. But in the book, *Foucault and the Iran Revolution*, Jennet Afary and KB Anderson wrote that, in his "post-modernist" pursuit of challenging the idea of "materialistic" rationale, Foucault fell for "the seductions of militant Islam." They wrote that in his search for "political spirituality", he ended up romanticising an idea which was totalitarian in nature.

It was Foucault's romanticised reading of the Iranian revolution which made most post-modernists claim that Iran's revolution was "unique" in the context of 20th century revolutions because it was religious in character. But since post-modernism often gets caught up in attacking grand narratives as an end product alone, it often fails to investigate the more complex historicity of events and forces which are present beneath the meta-narratives.

For example, to Foucault, in an era of communist revolutions, the Iranian revolution was unique because it was driven by "political spirituality." This was a naïve account. The Iranian Revolution actually unfolded like most 20th-century revolutions did — different

forces holding differing (even opposing) ideologies coming together to uproot a common enemy and then competing with each other in a grab for power. Had the post-modernists bothered to look beneath the meta-narratives of 20th century revolutions, they would not have ignored the following facts: The October 1917 "Bolshevik/communist revolution" in Russia was the outcome of a more broad-based revolution in February 1917 in which revolutionary and democratic groups of various shades of left Russian nationalists and urban middle-class groups collaborated to overthrow the Tsar.

The 'hard-left' group (the Bolsheviks) led by Marxist ideologue Vladimir Lenin, grabbed power in late 1917 through a *coup d'état*. Lenin wasn't even present during the February revolution. He returned to Russia from exile in Switzerland in April 1917.

The 1949 Communist revolution in China emerged during a tussle between Mao Tse Tung's communists and Chinese nationalists. Both had collaborated to oust the occupying Japanese forces during World War II. But in the post-War conflict for

power between the two, the communists managed to grab power.

The 'Islamist' Muslim Brotherhood collaborated with secular Egyptian nationalists during the 1952 uprising in Egypt which overthrew the Egyptian monarchy. In the post-1952 tussle between the two, the nationalists managed to oust the Brotherhood from the equation.

The 1959 Cuban revolution was a nationalist uprising. It wasn't until two years later, in 1961, that Fidel Castro — after consolidating his power — declared that his was a communist regime. During the 1979 Nicaraguan revolution, the communist 'Sandinistas' were overtly supported by that country's Catholic priests.

The post-modernists in their haste to declare the Iranian Revolution unique not only ignored the uniform patterns of 20th-century revolutions, but they also missed the 'political spirituality' present in the Nicaraguan revolution and the 1952 Egyptian uprising. What's more, to challenge the whole idea of the meta-narrative, they eventually created their own meta-narrative, by declaring the revolution in Iran as 'Islamic.'

Eleventh February, 2019, marked the 40th anniversary of the Iranian Revolution, which is also remembered as an "Islamic revolution" by some historians. But was it? Not according to celebrated American journalist and author Mark Bowden. In a November 18, 2009 piece for the *Wall Street Journal*, Bowden wrote that "the movement which ousted the Shah dictatorship was primarily a nationalist one." He added that many of those, who took part in the commotion, "were not motivated by the desire to establish a theocracy, but a desire to cast off authoritarianism."

Bowden is not the only prominent writer to hold this view. This assessment first emerged in 1982 in the book, *Iran Since the Revolution*,

Banks plan ₹500-cr fund to Jet Airways: PNB chief

A consortium of banks is considering an interim funding of ₹500 crore for debt-laden Jet Airways but a final decision is yet to be taken, Punjab National Bank Managing Director Sunil Mehta said on Friday.

PNB is part of the lenders' consortium, led by State Bank of India (SBI), that has extended loans to the airline.

The full service carrier is looking to raise funds and restructure its debt.

Regarding Jet Airways, Mehta said the consortium is looking at the entire process and something is being worked out.

"Of course, (the) consortium is in favour (of interim funding). It is a going concern and we would like to preserve its (airline's) value," he said.

About interim funding for the carrier, Mehta said, "it is too premature to tell you about that plan" and the bankers are already working on it.

The SBI has taken a lead on it, and let the entire plan be



worked out, he said, adding that it would be too early to announce the timings. "₹500 crore that you are talking about is the interim funding but banks are looking at the long term resolution of the issues for which the plan is already in place for discussions," he noted. He was responding to a query about the banks' extending interim funding to Jet Airways.



Waste to wonder park in Delhi opens for all

Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated the 'Wonders of World Park', constructed by the South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC) at Sarai Kale Khan

Delhi's latest tourist attraction, comprising the replicas of the Taj Mahal, the Great Pyramid of Giza, Eiffel Tower, Leaning Tower of Pisa, Christ the Redeemer statue of Rio de Janeiro, Rome's Colosseum and Statue of Liberty is now opened to the public.



Lauding the efforts of the South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC), the Union Home Minister said that the development of this park will provide a boost to the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan'. He said that it is time to move forward towards waste to wealth. "The SDMC has not only utilised waste piled up at landfill sites but has contributed substantially in containing air pollution," he said. The Lieutenant Governor of Delhi, Anil Bajjal said that this park is itself a wonder. He appreciated the development of waste to

wonder park and underlined the need for putting in place a proper mechanism of maintenance.

A senior SDMC official said that the seven replicas are made of 150 tonnes of scraps of automobile parts and other metal waste like fans, rods, iron sheets, nut-bolts, bicycle and bike parts and age-old appliances. "The replicas have been fabricated artistically and the park has been commissioned in six months," he said.

To avoid the rush of visitors, the civic body has decided to charge ₹50 for adults and ₹25 for children

(3-12 years) as an entry fee. However, senior citizens and children of corporation-run schools will not be charged any amount.

In order to light the park, the SDMC has installed solar trees and rooftop panels that will generate 50 KW powers. The surplus power will be sold to the power distribution companies to earn revenue, the official said.

Highlighting the steps taken to manage solid waste, SDMC Commissioner, Dr Puneet Kumar Goel said that the SDMC will achieve 100 per cent target of waste processing in the next year.

TIME HAS COME TO SET UP INDEPENDENT DEBT MANAGEMENT OFFICE: NITI AAYOG

Niti Aayog vice chairman Rajiv Kumar on Friday made a strong case for setting up of an independent debt management office outside the purview of Reserve Bank of India, saying it was "an idea whose time has come".

The idea of a Public Debt Management Agency (PDMA) was proposed by Finance Minister Arun Jaitley in his February 2015 Budget speech, though it has not yet been implemented.

"...It is important for this particular office be separate, because then you can pay

much more attention on public debt management. That will help the government in bring down cost of its debt," Kumar said at an event organised by Niti Aayog here.

At present, the government debt, including market borrowing, is managed by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

The Government has to decide how to segregate different functions of the RBI, Kumar said adding that government been very courageous to give the central bank the statutory authority for the inflation targeting.

₹ recovers 10 paise to 71.14 vs dollar, posts 2nd weekly gain

The rupee on Friday gained 10 paise to close at 71.14 against the US dollar on heavy foreign capital inflows after growing expectations that the Federal Reserve would keep interest rate on hold this year.

A strengthening dollar ahead of the US-China trade talks and surging crude oil prices, however, restricted the rupee gains.

Foreign portfolio investors pumped in a huge ₹6,311.01 crore into capital markets Friday, provisional exchange data showed.

Analysts said that weak US economic data propped up expectations that the US Fed would keep the rate steady this year. The Fed minutes this week had also called for patience over tightening of rates in view of slowing global economic growth.

Sensex ends marginally lower; bank stocks fall

The BSE Sensex ended marginally lower on Friday on losses in banking stocks as investors turned cautious after the minutes of RBI's latest policy meeting highlighted growth concerns.

The 30-share Sensex settled 26.87 points, or 0.07 per cent lower at 35,871.48. The broader NSE Nifty inched up 1.80 points, or 0.01 per cent, to 10,791.65.

During the week, Sensex rose 62.53 points or 0.17 per cent, while the Nifty advanced 67.25 points or 0.62 per cent.

Kotak Bank was the biggest loser in the Sensex pack Friday, falling 3.71 per cent, followed by RIL, HDFC Bank, Bajaj Finance, PowerGrid, IndusInd Bank, Asian Paints, HDFC and ITC.

On the other hand, Yes Bank was the top gainer, spurring 3.23 per cent.

Other winners were Vedanta, Tata Motors, NTPC, M&M, Maruti, ONGC and Hero MotorCorp, rising up to 2.86 per cent.

Sectorally, the BSE bank and finance indices fell up to 0.43 per cent. Energy and consumer durables too ended in the red.

BSE metal, auto, realty, power and oil and gas indices gained up to 1.62 per cent.

Broader indices outperformed the benchmarks, with the BSE Midcap index gaining 0.38 per cent and the small-cap gauge rising 0.77 per cent.

According to traders, despite positive global cues, investor sentiment turned weak after the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) released the minutes of its latest monetary policy meet after market hours Thursday.

The central bank's Monetary Policy Committee noted the "weakened growth momentum" amidst inflation cooling off as it delivered a surprise rate cut earlier this month.

In his debut policy review as RBI Governor, Shaktikanta Das argued that there was a need to look at growth concerns.

"Market turned range bound after the release of RBI minutes which hints at concerns of elevated core inflation and threat of global growth slowdown."

"Additionally, 10-year yield inched higher while bank index underperformed. Inflow of domestic funds to market remains positive while tepid reaction from FIIs and lack of major triggers are impacting

investors' sentiment," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services.

Domestic institutional investors (DIIs) were net buyers to the tune of Rs 202.10 crore, and foreign institutional investors (FIIs) also bought shares worth a net Rs 55.48 crore on Thursday, provisional data available with BSE showed.

Global markets rose as top trade officials from the US and China started their latest, and possibly the last round of talks to negotiate a comprehensive trade deal before their self-imposed deadline of March 1.

In Asia, Hong Kong's Hang Seng rose 0.65 per cent, Shanghai Composite Index jumped 1.91 per cent and Korea's Kospi gained 0.08 per cent. Japan's Nikkei ended 0.18 per cent lower.

In the Eurozone, Frankfurt's DAX was up 0.17 per cent, Paris CAC 40 rose 0.27 per cent, and London's FTSE gained 0.17 per cent in early deals.

The benchmark Brent crude futures rose 0.34 per cent to USD 67.30 per barrel.

Meanwhile, the rupee appreciated 5 paise to 71.19 against the US dollar intra-day.

OFB GETS BULK PRODUCTION CLEARANCE FOR 'DHANUSH'

The Ordnance Factory Board (OFB) has received the bulk production clearance (BPC) from the Indian Army and the Ministry of Defence for production of 114 of the first ever indigenous 155mm x 45 calibre artillery gun—'Dhanush'.

The weapon is the first, long-range artillery gun to be produced in India and is considered to be a major success story of the 'Make in India' initiative. The gun is equipped with inertial navigation-based sighting system, auto-laying facility, on-board ballistic computation and an advanced day and night direct firing system. The self-propulsion unit allows the gun to negotiate and deploy itself in mountainous terrains with ease.

'Dhanush' has been mechanically upgraded to fire standard NATO 155 mm ammunition and can accommodate both, boll bags and the bi-modular charge system (BMCS), which have resulted in increasing the range. The gun has also been electronically upgraded to enhance the firing accuracies, laying speeds of the existing gun and to provide compatibility with various kinds of ammo as well.

The performance of 'Dhanush' has been evaluated



under arduous conditions in several phases. The guns travelled extensively in towed and self-propelled mode in all terrains viz desert and high altitude with each gun clocking over 1600 km. Such an extensive exercise was carried out by the user for the first time for any gun system under the process of induction.

The manufacture of a 155 mm modern artillery gun was initially seen as a challenge for OFB as it was to change the vision parameters from 155 x 39 calibre to 155 x 45 calibre. The organisation received the transfer of technology (ToT)

documents pertaining to the 155x39 calibre and then converted it to 155x45 calibre successfully.

'Dhanush' is the product of joint efforts by the OFB and the Indian Army with contributions from Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), the Directorate General of Quality Assurance (DGQA), Defence Public Sector Undertakings (DPSUs) such as Bharat Electronics Limited, public sector undertakings such as Steel Authority of India Limited and several other private sector enterprises.

Trump, Kim to have one-on-one meet

US President Donald Trump and North Korean leader Kim Jong-un will meet one-on-one and spend substantial amount of time together next week when the two leaders meet in Hanoi, Vietnam, the White House said on Thursday.

Trump and Kim are meeting for their second summit on February 27 and 28. The first one was on June 12 in Singapore, which was part of the president's effort to improve his country's relationship with North Korea and ultimately have a denuclearised state.

"There will be opportunities for the two leaders to see one another one-on-one, to share a meal and indeed for expanded meetings of their respective delegations in laying out the objectives (which) is ultimately about denuclearisation of North Korea," a senior administration official told reporters during a conference call.

already between the two sides and that is the overriding goal that President Trump is seeking to achieve with this summit," the official said, who spoke with reporters on condition of anonymity.

This is an important step towards that ultimate goal, the official noted. "After breaking the ice with Kim in some aspects in June, Trump is also looking to talk in depth about the kind of future that

North Korea could enjoy if it follows through on its commitment to the final and full of denuclearisation," the official said.

Trump would be accompanied by his Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, and several of his top aides for the second summit meeting with the North Korean leader. Hundreds of reporters are travelling to Hanoi to cover the much-anticipated summit.

N Korea has asked for help on food shortages: UN

The United Nations says North Korea's Government has asked for help from international humanitarian groups to combat food shortages.

UN Spokesman Stephane Dujarric said Thursday that food production figures provided by North Korea show "there is a food gap of about 1.4 million tons expected for 2019, and that's crops including rice, wheat, potato and soybeans."

Dujarric says the UN has "expressed and will continue to express our concern about the deteriorating food security situation" in North Korea.

He says the UN "at various levels" is consulting with the North Korean Government "to further understand the impact of food security on the most vulnerable people, in order to take early action to address the humanitarian needs."

ISIS jihadi girl's family plead for her baby's UK entry

The family of a UK girl of Bangladeshi descent, who fled to join Islamic State (ISIS) in 2015, has appealed to the Government to allow her new born baby to be rescued from the Syrian refugee camp and raised in Britain.

Sister of Shamima Begum, Renu, has written to UK home secretary Sajid Javid urging for his assistance and also informed him of the family's plan to help her 19-year-old sister mount a legal challenge against his decision to revoke her British citizenship. "We were pleased to learn from your comments in the Commons that you recognise my nephew, Shamima's son, as a British citizen," Renu Begum said in a letter to the UK Home Secretary.

"As a family, we ask now how we can assist you in bringing my nephew home to us. In all of this debacle, he is the one true innocent and should not lose the privilege of being raised in the safety of this country," it notes.

US aid to Venezuela a pretext for military action, says Russia

Russia on Friday accused the United States of using aid deliveries to Venezuela as a ploy to carry out military action against President Nicolas Maduro's Government.

"A dangerous provocation, instigated and led by Washington, is planned for February 23," foreign ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova said, pointing to efforts by opposition leader Juan Guaido to pick up US aid being stockpiled on the Colombian border.

Guaido's plans to try to bring the aid across the border are aimed at provoking clashes, she said, to provide "a convenient pretext for conducting military action".

Russia is a key supporter of Maduro's government and has repeatedly accused Washington of trying to carry out a coup in Venezuela. On Thursday, Guaido set out in a convoy to collect US-supplied food and medicine

stockpiled in Colombia, vowing to bring in the aid by Saturday.

Maduro has closed the border with Brazil to prevent the entry of aid and the military has beefed up security at the Colombian border.

Zakharova alleged that the US had moved special forces and military equipment "closer to Venezuelan territory" and was considering large-scale weapons purchases to arm the opposition.

Noting that it had been five years since the Ukrainian revolution that ousted a Russian-backed leader — which Moscow has accused the US of orchestrating — Zakharova said Washington was preparing for more regime change in Venezuela.

EARTHQUAKE WITH 7.5 MAGNITUDE HITS ECUADOR
Quito: An earthquake with a magnitude of 7.5 hit Ecuador Friday but there were no immediate reports of casualties or major damage. The quake struck before dawn in Ecuador's eastern Amazon region 17 kilometers (10 miles) from the town of Montalvo near the border with Peru, the US Geological Survey said.

SWEDEN GETS 4.5 YEARS FOR ROYAL JEWELS HEIST
Copenhagen: A 22-year-old Swede was sentenced Friday to four and a half years in prison after he was convicted of stealing 17th-century Swedish royal treasures estimated to be worth 65 million kronor (USD 7 million) from a cathedral last year. The Eskilstuna District Court said Johan Niklas Backstrom stole two crowns and an orb used at the funerals of King Karl IX and Queen Kristina. The jewels, dating from 1611, had been on display in Strangnas Cathedral, west of Stockholm.





The smart hatter

Actor AJAY DEVGN dabbles in comedy with his latest film, *Total Dhamaal*, but is equally at ease in other genres, says SAIMI SATTAR



Ajay Devgn has found quite the spot. While the rest of the cast of *Total Dhamaal* is cooped up inside a hall in a hotel, he has a small set-up just outside, open to the sky, which is certainly pleasant given the weather. "Oh, that's because I smoke," he says with a laugh and one can't help but notice a pack of cigarettes lying prominently on the table. As is wont, I try to put on the recorder on my phone for the interview while Ajay narrates that he was born in Delhi but does not know much of it, even as I keep fiddling with the device waiting for it to switch on. When I confess that it has frozen, Ajay asks me if he can help and tries to, but clearly the app has a mind of its own and won't succumb even to the charms of a celebrity actor who has more than a hundred films to boot. Casting it aside, I decide to go the old fashioned way and jot down what he says.

Ajay explains that the film is called an adventure comedy as there is hardly a moment where the cast is in a situation which cannot be classified as an escapade. "Except for one court scene with Anil Kapoor and Madhuri Dixit, the entire cast is either mid-air or in water or in trouble. It has an *Indiana Jones* like feel," says the actor who rode astride two bikes into collective national conscience with *Phool Aur Kaante* in 1991 for which he got the best Filmfare Male Debut Award.

However, it is Ajay's funny bone that has given him huge career hits and is on display in the third installment of the *Dhamaal* franchise. "The content in comedies is what makes you laugh. That depth has been there in the *Golmaal* series. Making people laugh is not easy in general. Add to it the fact that you can't tickle them twice with the same joke, the humour loses punch. So the content has to be fresh. Then as performers, after the gag has been written, it is also essential to understand how much to stretch the joke, the appropriate amount of energy needed to perform it and also an understanding of when and how it can nosedive if not executed well. Some jokes need a poker face and others need a lot of action," says the actor who in the initial years of his career was known for his intense and action roles. However, Ajay made a transition and can dabble in different genres with seemingly equal ease. "If you aren't classified, that is the best place to be in as an actor. If I did one genre all the time, that is what is likely to happen. I keep on reinventing myself which keeps me going. In fact, I would say I do not understand a genre. What I understand are the characters and I play them. Guddu in *Total Dhamaal* doesn't know the genre. He knows what he has to do and does it," says the actor.

The seamless switch between the characters is not surprising given his avid interest in world cinema. However, Ajay points out, "I do like to watch world cinema but you need to be in the mood to do so. If you are viewing it with someone, they need to identify with that kind of films. Plus, even when watching it alone, you need to be in a certain frame of mind. However, when you go out with friends or family, it is more likely that you would opt for something which is a comedy or is light-hearted."

Talking about why formula or big stars are no longer a guarantee of success as was obvious from the flops that most of the major stars had to face last year, he says, "Actors now need to know that they can no longer fool the audience. Earlier, it was possible to work around with the same formula but it is not happening any longer. Charisma won't work until the content is good. Besides, the audience, which is more educated and exposed to different experiences now, is more discerning and is constantly evolving." That's what he misses for two milestone performances of his career. "If I did something like *Zakhm* (1998) today or for that matter *Raincoat* (2004), the audience would have been more receptive and appreciated me better. Both the films got a lot of critical appreciation and were praised but the box office collections did not really match up. Today, they would have got the money too," he says.

For somewhere who has traversed a wide arc of creativity, filling out different characters, he has his keen eyes on the script as well as his instincts to invest each role with originality. "I played a gangster in *Company* and then repeated it again in *Once Upon A Time in Mumbai* but no one can say that the characters were similar," says the intelligent actor.

Ajay is starring next in *De De Pyaar De*, which is scheduled to release tentatively around May this year. Also on the cards is Neeraj Pandey's *Chanakya* where he embodies the role of the political thinker, economist and royal advisor. Another historical that he is producing and starring in is *Tanaji - The Unsung Warrior*. "My reason for taking up *Tanaji* is primarily because I liked the script. He was a great historical figure and sacrificed a lot but many people in Maharashtra and most outside have not heard of him. This makes our effort to bring his story to the big screen worthy," says he. However, many historicals have invited the ire of self-appointed censors of history. So does he fear controversies? Reasons Ajay, "The problem with our country is that it is really diverse and one group or the other might find something offensive. The final say should be that of the court if there is any difference of opinion and people should just go with the verdict."

A connected citizen, Ajay has taken a clear stand on issues. When #MeToo rocked the Hindi film industry last year, he wrote on his Twitter handle, "I'm disturbed by all the happenings with regards to #MeToo. My company and I believe in providing women with utmost respect and safety. If anyone has wronged even a single woman, neither ADF (Ajay Devgn Films) nor I will stand for it." And he makes no bones about it even now and says, "We respect women. We always believed in this. If two people are involved and it is consensual we are no one to judge them. But it should not be forced."

On another issue, that of nepotism that keeps on making a buzz in the industry time and again, Ajay says, "It is not as if other people do not get chances. They do. If you are connected you do get an initial shot at it but then you have to prove yourself. Ultimately it depends on whether the audience likes you or not." Incidentally his daughter Nyssa is not interested in films at all and he says that she does not have an aptitude for the medium. "She is studying in Singapore," he says.

Recently, Ajay and his actor wife Kajol promoted a Unilever campaign called StartLittleGood to spread awareness about proper recycling of plastic. "I've been aware of global warming. I have been obsessed with being environmentally conscious at home. I am that person who is teased constantly by his sisters for putting off lights and fans when not in use," he says.

Clearly, he does like to dabble in a whole lot of things with equal ease.

◆ **What made you take up *The Voice*?**
This music competition show transcends all barriers of physical appearance, background, religion and gender, to provide a platform for the budding singing talent solely based on their core competence. The entire concept of the "blind auditions" is very innovative where we do not see the contestant and just hear them and if their voice strikes a chord, we turn our chairs for them. It is a journey of finding raw talent, polishing and nurturing it through the mentorship by coaches and enabling them to reach their potential. The platform gives an opportunity for talent to work with their dream coaches and that is a massive opportunity for any aspiring singer. For the first time ever in the history of the show, the format has been altered to introduce the concept of a super guru with the one and only A R Rahman stepping into the shoes. I am joined by popular singers Harshdeep Kaur, Kanika Kapoor and Armaan Malik as coaches.



◆ **Could you elaborate on your role as a coach and what you plan to bring to the show?**

CONVERSATION 40 MINUTES

A wide arc

Actor VIJAY VARMA tells CHAHAK MITTAL that just as humans try to steal others' experiences and recreate them in their own lives, an actor's versatility comes from the various shoes he steps into

It was probably Zoya Akhtar's "insightful eye" with which she observed actor Vijay Varma's versatility and acting skills and welcomed him on board the cast of *Gully Boy*. The character of Moeen has become a favourite with just a handful of scenes and has been also receiving immense appreciation for his role as Ranveer Singh's friend and conscience-keeper.

The actor believes that when he was given the dialogues to prepare, the audition went well and he indeed did "a fairly well job". However, the most special part,

he says, was Zoya's eye for detail and content that mattered. "It's great to work with a director like her. She respects hard work and has a heart for quality. It's important to have such directors around," says he.

Vijay has played characters that were completely different in films like *Chittagong*, *Monsoon Shootout* and *Pink* previously. Preparing for his role in *Gully Boy* was another challenge, he says. "It needed a lot of internal and mental work to understand and fit into the world that the filmmakers wanted to portray in

the film. From being a garage mechanic, drug peddler, and even a thief amidst the dark, Moeen had a lot of personalities rather than just one. He knew his punishment was justified. He used kids for labour but gave them a roof over their heads. He was a good friend too. So, there was a great deal of emotional work," says Vijay and goes on to add that picking up the language and accent also had to be worked upon. "I spoke to a lot of local slum people in order to understand and catch their terminology and bring out that worn out



feeling in my character."

Seminal roles sometimes also shape actors as people and change their outlook on life. Vijay tells us what this role had taught him. He says, "You do get a better insight in certain segments and geography, about which you might have never

thought before. It makes you delve deeper into things unfamiliar to you. As humans, we are always trying to find inspiration from other people, moments and places. We try to steal experiences from others' lives and try to recreate them in our own. Similarly, an actor also

lives many lives and tries to imitate some of them in reality — the ones which they find worth recreating or living for."

While talking about *Gully Boy* as a film, he feels that it is important to create and show films with such themes. He says that it is "captivating" and "immersive" in the sense that it shows reality and connects with common people. "It's about their dreams and struggles. It's also important to acknowledge street artists like these since they never receive recognition and applause for their amazing talent. They are despised even by their own families. It's not considered as an art," says he.

For Vijay, there's no particular genre that he fits in perfectly, rather he believes that if he'd be given a role in any kind — suspense, action, dark comedy, thriller — he would certainly give his best and "do a good job."

Fendi honours Lagerfeld

The final collection at the Milan fashion week was dedicated to the fashion designer

Fendi paid understated tribute to Karl Lagerfeld, who died this week and was the Rome-based fashion house's creative director for 54 years.

The fashion house said in notes for its Milan Fashion Week show that the Fall/Winter 2019-2020 collection "is the final collection designed by Karl Lagerfeld, representing a lifetime of dedication and creation from 1965 until today."

Reproductions of five of Lagerfeld's sketches accompanied the notes, summing up the looks. A small card came printed with his signature and the Fendi "F" that had a heart forming the cross-stroke. The date of the designer's death was on the back: 19-02-2019.

A video recorded before his death showed Lagerfeld being asked to draw himself as he appeared on his first day at Fendi.

"Well, that's prehistoric," the designer said. "In the 1960s, we didn't hold back."

His personal Fendi preview look: a Cerruti hat over his long hair, dark sunglasses, a printed Lavalliere tie, a yellow-and-red English hunting jacket in Scottish tweed, French-style culottes and a bag that he had found in Milan.

"That was my style. Disreputable," the late designer told the camera in French.

Other highlights from the second day of Milan Fashion Week:

LAGERFELD'S FENDI FINALE

Karl Lagerfeld's grand finale at Fendi emulated the designer's signature style, with striking high collars and the models wearing ponytails at the nape.

The opening look featured a huge bow tie and a double-breasted jacket with white accents, worn with a mini-skirt showing off Fendi tights. That look was elaborated on to show the same jacket as a long overcoat, then paired with wide-legged pleated trousers with white stripe accents. A neat, point-collared shirt buttoned to the top unified the outfits.

A series of wide-pleated skirts in shiny finishes or sheers, as well as structured dresses with pagoda shoulders, pointy collars and cinched waists feminized the collection.

Coats were luxurious furs with the elegant double-F logo in cursive - known as Lagerfeld's curling "Karligraphy" - and laser-cut leather with zippers that opened the sleeves and the back. Shiny leather coats were shaped like capes and had open-zip arms and fur collars.

Beyond neutral tones, Lagerfeld included flashes of daffodil yellow, seafoam green and tangerine. The looks were finished with fur riding caps, the Fendi Peekaboo bag with perforated detailing or the updated Baguette bag with a multi-strap harness.

Gigi Hadid closed the show in a diaphanous mango dress with a snug Fendi-logged bodysuit. A big bow floated on the back.

FENDI'S PUBLIC FAREWELL

Silvia Venturini Fendi, who was a child when Lagerfeld joined Fendi and revolutionized fur at her family's fashion house, thanked the fashion crowd and took a bow, then clenched her fists and stepped backstage.

A screen descended: Backstage was kept private.

Venturini Fendi in a note said the bond between Lagerfeld and Fendi "is fashion's longest love story."

"When we called just a few days before the show, his only thoughts were on the richness and the beauty of the collection," she wrote. "It's a true testament to his character. He shall be so missed."



MAX MARA CELEBRATES THE POLITICS OF GLAMOR

Max Mara dedicated its collection to the "boss lady," a nod to the women who have strode to power in their luxury outerwear and business attire.

The show title, "the politics of glamor," was also a not-so-hidden reference to the brick-red "Fire Coat" that U.S. House Minority leader Nancy Pelosi wore to a White House showdown with President Donald Trump. A flurry of social media attention prompted the fashion house to reissue the high-neck coat.

Most of the looks in the latest collection for next fall and winter were for serious day dressing, with a focus on short skirts or longer versions that appeared cut from trousers, but with deep slits to show off knee-high, faux croc boots.

Outerwear varied from ankle-length sleeveless coats with oversized pockets and to poncho coats with furry collars. Zips and pockets gave a sense of utility.

Max Mara punctuated its trademark neutral monotonous with trios of colors and prints, opening the show with identical mini-skirt, business looks in an emerald green, sky blue and canary yellow. The outfits were topped with large, enveloping alpaca cardigans.

Wools mixed with technical fabrics, leathers and fur for contemporary styling. Neutral monotonous in ivory, camel and caramel toast gave way to animal prints and heritage prints with heart motifs.

Accessories included an innovative bag that draped around the neck like a scarf and incorporated two compartments on each end, or a small clutch attached to the body with a harness.

Eva Herzigova closed the show with a black mini with the slightest golden sheen, worn with a black gran-




ite textured coat that was mined from the depths of fashion. Kaia Gerber rocked a layered off-white look with a rich, furry overcoat and single-button suit coat.

Red, along with black and white, "resets everything you see around, that is so much, too much," Armani said.

PRADA EXPLORES LOVE AND WAR

Prada's collection for next fall and winter explores the dichotomy between war and romance, the tug between better and baser impulses.

The collection veers from military looks in Loden textiles with combat boots but softened with furry backpacks to romantic styles with dresses strewn with floral appliques or layered with lace accents.

"It is about romance, but romance and fear," the designer said after the show. "In the sense that the two forces I feel at the moment are fear and danger, but at the same time romance is the solution. So these are pieces of love stories, introducing good in a world that has a lot of bad."

THE PRICE IS RIGHT AT MOSCHINO

Jeremy Scott staged a tongue-in-cheek Moschino game show to show off his collection of slinky dresses and gold lame on women with 1970s bouffants.

The collection fully embraced the early television era, with handbags shaped as TV dinners, toothpaste tubes and champagne bottles, reflecting the reality of home cuisine, a major TV-era advertising force and the millionaire dreams of the television audience.

Models shimmied up against a red Ferrari, a grandfather clock, kitchen appliances and a La-Z-Boy recliner — the latter of which boasted price tags below most present-day luxury brand apparel.

Scott basked in the irony, taking a star turn under a shower of big gold confetti.

ONENESS WITH NATURE

Photographer JUHI SAKLANI's captures ecology which has been integrated with human life

For photographer Juhi Saklani, life can persist in most unexpected places like a grand tree braving traffic, pollution, and dirt of a busy Delhi road, what she exclaims as almost a "national monument". Displayed in 2019 Habitat Photosphere on 'Bhu/Earth', among many others, the trees photograph reminds humans of their oneness with nature.

Habitat Photosphere, an India Habitat Centre (IHC) initiative, is geared towards sensitisation of a sustainable environment and cultural sustainability through the medium of photography.

With this year's theme as 'Bhu/Earth', the ongoing exhibition is currently blooming with photographs, installations and interactive events.

Saklani, one of the four awardees of the Photosphere Fellowship, is exploring art and ecology through photographs of trees growing through old walls and buildings, and inhabiting books, maps and newspapers.

Some exhibited works in her series 'Human/Nature' use "regular headlines about trees being felled for buildings, roads, river interlinking, smart city projects, parking and more" as images.

The series emerged from her "reading and conversations around deep ecology and the nature of the ecological crisis we find ourselves in today — how to live with climate change, species extinction, dramatic loss of biodiversity, depletion of water, massive deforestation, critical levels of pollution", she said.

"I am still a student of ecological issues and philosophies, but some of it has seeped into the photographs. I truly feel that humans need to start thinking of themselves as a part of nature, as opposed to controllers or 'conquerors' of nature," Saklani, who has previously been an editor and writer with Outlook Traveller for nearly a decade, said.

Saklani, whose passion for photography started with taking photographs to support her articles, believes trees to be companions and healers that give solace. For her, the images featuring trees are not works of art - what is art are trees themselves.

A special section 'A Window Into Redevelopment' is a tribute to the people of Delhi who in June-July 2018 protested the "proposed cutting of some 15,000 trees in Sarojini Nagar and Netaji Nagar" - government housing colonies



which were to be "redeveloped" to host commercial spaces.

"In face of official reports which said Sarojini Nagar was a place of 'no significant biodiversity', experts found 26 bird species and 11 types of butterflies in just a two-day survey.

"Activists conducted tree surveys in Netaji Nagar and found an irreplaceable wealth of bargads, peepals, semals, neems, jamuns, amaltas..." a note on the section said.

Thanks to the efforts of the protesters, "the company NBCC has to redesign its projects to minimise tree loss", the writer, who feels meditative while clicking trees, said.

'A Window Into Redevelopment', interestingly, has been curated as a combination of photographs and rustic-looking wooden windows allowing one to peep at the collages in which the threatened trees and demolished houses of these colonies are still trying to co-exist.

"It's also a protest against the top heavy planning that does not involve people in the decisions about their city's future. And a reminder that people need to stay informed about what is happening to their city."

Along with other awardees and more varied exhibitors, Saklani's earthy take on the Photosphere theme of 'Bhu' is open for the public to view till March 18 at the IHC here.

The Photosphere has been curated by art historian Alka Pande. —IANS

No decision on Pak WC match, CoA to consult Govt: Vinod Rai

The Committee of Administrators (CoA) running Indian cricket on Friday decided against taking any stand on the World Cup clash against Pakistan but urged the ICC and other nations to "sever ties" with countries from where "terrorism emanates".

There has been a call to boycott the June 16 World Cup face-off against Pakistan at the Old Trafford in the aftermath of the Pulwama terror attack, which killed more than 40 CRPF personnel.

In a meeting to address the spiralling speculation around the match, the CoA deliberated on the matter but did not take any position for now.

"The 16th of June is very far away. We will take a call on that much later and in consultation with the government," CoA chief Vinod Rai said after the meeting.

Asked if players have been consulted on the issue, Rai replied in the negative.

"In an e-mail to the ICC, we have expressed our concerns about the terrorist attack that has taken place. We are telling them that security of players and match officials should be appropriately taken care of," Rai said.

"And number two, we must sever ties with nations from which such terrorism emanates. We will express our concern on an appropriate forum," Rai said indicating that the matter will be raised at the ICC quarterly Board meeting in Dubai.

No IPL opening ceremony

All funds to go for Pulwama martyrs

The IPL will not have an opening ceremony this year after the Committee of Administrators (CoA) running Indian cricket on Friday decided to allocate the money set aside for it to the families of the CRPF personnel killed in the Pulwama terror attack.

The opening ceremonies of the cash-rich T20 league are a heady mix of glitz and glamour with performances by Bollywood stars being the highlight.

However, as a mark of

respect to the slain CRPF men, it has been decided to scrap the ceremony for the event's 12th edition beginning March 23.

"We will not have any inaugural function for the IPL and the money budgeted for that goes to the martyrs' families," said Committee of Administrators chairman Vinod Rai.

It was BCCI acting president CK Khanna, who had officially made the proposal to donate at least ₹5 crore for the martyrs' families.

It is learnt that 2018 IPL opening ceremony's budget was in the tune of ₹15 crore and something similar to that amount will be donated.

The ICC meeting is scheduled to be held from February 26 to March 2.

In the mail sent to the world body, BCCI said it is concerned about the security of Indian players heading into the World Cup.

"BCCI fears for the safety and security of players and match officials participating in upcoming ICC events including the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019. Most countries from which the members of the ICC hail (including United Kingdom) have strongly condemned this terrorist attack and expressed solidarity with India," the letter stated.

"The BCCI trusts that the ICC and ECB will ensure that the most robust security is

provided to players, match officials and fans of Indian cricket for the upcoming World Cup," it said.

It was a foregone conclusion that CoA would not take any decision on the matter as the ICC can't ban Pakistan as per rules.

"We can never win a floor Test if we try and pass a resolution to ban Pakistan from the World Cup. We currently don't have majority in ICC. In fact, ICC chairman Shashank Manohar, in his individual capacity, has more votes than BCCI at the present moment," a senior BCCI official said.

It is understood that BCCI officials are also concerned that such a stand might cost them the hosting rights of the 2021 Champions Trophy and the 2023 World Cup.

IOC suspends discussions with India for hosting global events

The denial of visas to Pakistani shooters in the Delhi World Cup has jeopardised India's chances of hosting the Olympics or any global event with the International Olympic Committee (IOC) suspending all such discussions with the country and recommending that no big tournament be awarded to it.

India denied visas to Pakistani shooters for the World Cup that starts on Saturday in the wake of the Pulwama terror attack. As a result, the IOC revoked the two Olympic quotas on offer in the men's 25m Rapid Fire Pistol competition of the event.

However, the bigger repercussion was the world body's declaration that it would not engage with India on discussions to host major events. The country aspires to host the 2026 Youth Olympics, the 2032 Summer Olympics and the 2030 Asian Games.

The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) has already sent an expression of interest to the IOC for the 2032 Games and the bidding process for the 2026 showpiece is expected to start next year.

The IOC said its stand against the country will remain until clear "written guarantees are obtained from the Indian government to ensure the entry of all participants in such events in full compliance with the rules of the Olympic charter."

"This situation (at the ISSF World Cup) goes against the fundamental principles of the Olympic charter, in particular the principles of non-discrimination..." the IOC stated after a meeting of its executive board in Lausanne on Thursday evening.

"As a result, the IOC executive board also decided to suspend all discussions with the Indian NOC and government regarding the potential appli-

IOC TAKES AWAY 2 QUOTA, SPARES 14

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) decided against withdrawing all the Olympic quotas from the shooting World Cup here and revoked just two after visas were denied to Pakistani shooters in the aftermath of the Pulwama terror attack.

Within hours of International Shooting Federation (ISSF) President Vladimir Lisin's declaration that all the 16 quotas have been revoked due to the situation with Pakistan, the IOC said the Olympic qualification status has been withdrawn from only the men's 25m Rapid Fire Pistol event. This event had two spots on offer.

"The IOC restricted the withdrawal of recognition as an Olympic qualification event to the 25m rapid fire pistol competition in which the two Pakistani athletes were supposed to participate," the IOC said in a statement after its executive board meeting in Lausanne, Switzerland.



"This happened in the interest of the other 500 athletes from 61 countries participating in the other events who are already in India for their competition," it added.

The National Rifles Association of India (NRAI) heaved a sigh of relief a day before the start of the competition.

"The Organising Committee of the New Delhi World Cup wishes to unequivocally thank the ISSF President Vladimir Lisin, the ISSF Secretary General Alexander Ratner, the IOA President Dr Narinder Batra, and the Minister for Youth Affairs and Sports Col (Retd) RVS Rathore for ensuring the best possible outcome to a vexed and complex scenario," NRAI President Raninder Singh said.

ISSF World Cup: Apurvi, Anjum, Elavenil in action on day 1

Anjum Moudgil, Apurvi Chandela and Elavenil Valaraivan will lead India's charge in women's 10m air rifle event on the first day of competition at the season-opening ISSF shooting World Cup on Saturday.

The immensely talented Mehuli Ghosh will shoot in Minimum Qualification Score (MQS) at the Dr Karni Singh Range.

They are among 102 competitors from 44 nations in the fray in the women's 10m event. India have secured both their Olympic quotas in the event through Moudgil and Chandela at the World Championships last September.

Besides the men's 25m rapid fire pistol and the two 10m mixed team air rifle and air pistol events, the rest of the seven events in the five-day competition will distribute two Olympic quotas each.

India will compete for 12 quotas in six events, besides trying to win medals.

Spinner Bisht guides India to 66-run

Left-arm spinner Ekta Bisht snared four wickets as Indian bowlers dished out a clinical effort to beat England by 66 runs in the first ODI of the ICC Women's Championship here on Friday.

Bisht returned with impressive figures of four for 25 to help Indian women defend a modest a 203-run target by bundling out England women for a paltry 136 in 41 overs to take a 1-0 lead in the three-match series.

Bisht was ably supported by pacer Shikha Pandey (2/21), Deepti Sharma (2/33) and veteran Jhulan Goswami (1/19) as India comfortably grabbed two points in the ICC Women's Championship.

For the visitors, Natalie Sciver top-scored with a 66-ball 44, while skipper Heather Knight remained unbeaten on 39.

Chasing the modest target, England, in fact, were in a comfortable position at 111 for three by the end of the 30th over before the visitors crumbled like a pack of cards, losing their last seven batswomen for just 24 runs to surrender the match.

Bisht wrecked England women by taking three wickets in a span of five balls in the 41st over to register the comfortable win for her side.

Earlier, young Jemimah Rodrigues top-scored for Indian women, scoring 48 off



58 balls while skipper Mithali Raj made 44 off 77 deliveries.

Asked to bat, openers Smriti Mandhana (24) and Rodrigues (48) gave a steady start to India's innings sharing 69 runs for the opening wicket.

But just after the drinks break, Mandhana played on a Georgia Elwiss delivery

while going for a pull. India then lost Deepti Sharma (7), who was stumped by Sarah Taylor off Sophie Ecclestone.

Ecclestone, stuck in her very next over, removing a well-set Jemimah as India slumped to 92 for 3.

Then Sciver struck twice in the 22nd over -- first

removing debutant Harleen Deol (2) and then Mona Meshram (0) as India looked in a spot of bother.

But Raj and wicket-keeper Bhatia then joined hands and steadied the ship with a 54-run stand off 94 balls for the sixth wicket.

Raj, who struck four boundaries, was poised for

another fifty before she was trapped in front of the wicket by Elwiss in the 42nd over.

After Raj's dismissal, wickets kept tumbling at the other end before Goswami chipped in with a handy 30-run knock off 37 balls, which included three fours and a six, to take the hosts past the 200-run mark.

Pak Olympic Association hails IOC decision

The National Olympic Association of Pakistan (POA) on Friday supported its parent body IOC for removing Olympic quotas in the men's 25m rapid fire pistol event of the ongoing ISSF World Cup in Delhi, where its country's shooters could not compete due to visa issues.

POA President, General (ret'd) Arif Hasan, said it was disappointing that two Pakistani shooters were not allowed to participate in the ISSF event in Delhi.

The Indian High Commission didn't issue visa to the two shooters and team manager after the Indian Shooting body, NRAI, had assured the International Shooting Federation (ISSF) that it had got clearance from the host country's home ministry for the visa.

"We were very disappointed once our athletes were not allowed to participate for an event for which they had been preparing for a very long time. We have always been of the view that sports must be used as a means to build bridges between communities and countries," Arif Hasan said in a statement.

"Greatly disappointed we had no option left but to refer the matter to the IOC. As a consequence, the IOC Executive Board took a very prudent and balanced decision," he said. We are very grateful to the IOC for this very well considered decision whereby the right of athletes to participate without any let or hindrance has been upheld."

Pakistan had nominated Ghulam Mustafa Bashir and Muhammad Khalil Akhtar, to contest in the 25m rapid fire pistol event.

Disappointing to see cricket being targeted: Sarfaraz

Sarfaraz Ahmed is "disappointed" that cricket is being targeted after the Pulwama terror attack and said the high-profile India-Pakistan World Cup game should go ahead as planned despite calls for the match's boycott from several quarters of the neighbouring country.

The Pakistan captain insisted that sports should never be mixed with politics and said in the interest of the cricket crazy fans of both the countries, the match should be played.

"The India and Pakistan match should be played as per schedule as there are millions of people who want to watch this game. I just don't think cricket should be targeted for political gains," Sarfaraz told the CricketPakistan.Com.Pk website.

"It is disappointing to see cricket being targeted after the Pulwama incident. I don't recall Pakistan ever mixing sports with politics," he said.

The fate of the much-anticipated World Cup match to be held on June 16 at the Old Trafford lies in limbo after several former Indian cricketers called for its boycott in the aftermath of the ghastly terror attack.

"Sports should just be

taken as sports," Sarfaraz added.

The call to boycott the match has come from some prominent names in Indian cricket such as senior off-spinner Harbhajan Singh and former captain Mohammed Azharuddin.

But offering a different view, batting great Sunil Gavaskar and Sachin Tendulkar have stated that India should not hand over points to Pakistan by boycotting the game. They, however, advocated continued shunning of bilateral cricket ties.

Former Pakistan captain and batting great Javed Miandad too was of the view that the game shouldn't be targeted.

"I felt bad after hearing about our pictures being removed from their (Indian) stadiums. Now this talk of boycotting the World Cup. I think India need to understand they can face consequences of such an action," Miandad said.

"I don't understand the mindset. Do they really think they (India) can get away without playing the World Cup match?" he asked.

He said India need to change its policy of mixing sports with politics.

"I just hope better sense prevails."

Need to play spin better: Knight

Undeterred by the 66-run loss in the opening women's ODI international against India, England skipper Heather Knight on Friday said the World Cup holders are capable of bouncing back in the three-match series.

"The total was perfectly chaseable. We lost the first game in the World Cup. We have lost games earlier in the series and come back as well. We are taking one game at a time. We need to build partnerships," Knight said at the post-match conference.

"We bowled well, but were unlucky not to take more wickets up front. But we were more than happy with 200 (plus) to chase," insisted Heather, who remained unbeaten on 39 in 66 balls.

Conceding that the team were unable to play spin well on Friday, Heather said the key was to play a couple of overs to gauge the turn and bounce.

"I don't think we played it



(spin) particularly well today. The pitch started to turn and deteriorated too. There was inconsistent spin as well which makes it harder. It was

sticky, it turned but once you got to play 15-20 balls it became easier to play shots. The first 10-15 balls were the key," she said.

First time I've taken three wickets in an over in ODIs: Ekta

Left-arm orthodox bowler Ekta Bisht, who starred in India women's 66-run win over England women in the opening ODI here on Friday, said this was the first time she had scalped three wickets in an over in the fifty over format although she has a hat-trick in T20 cricket.

The 33-year-old left arm spinner from Uttar Pradesh, who finished with fine figures of four for 25 against the current world champions, also credited newly-appointed coach W V Raman, for her success.

"I have taken a hat-trick in T20, but this is the first time in ODIs that I have taken three wickets in an over. But, I have figures of 10 overs, 8 runs and 5 wickets against Pakistan," the Almora-born Bisht told



reporters at the post match media conference.

Bisht took three wickets in the 41st over to seal India's win and help the hosts take a 1-0 lead in the three-match series, and more importantly, grab two points in the ICC Women's Championship.

"Whenever Raman sir finds any fault, he makes it a point to come and rectify those errors. He stresses on little points and that helps us. Earlier, I was bowling sideways, but he told me to change that action a bit and that helped," said Bisht, crediting Raman, who started his career as a left-arm spinner.

Bisht also said that they expected the pitch to help the spinners later in the day.

"In the morning it looked the ball would skid. But later, when I spoke to Poonam (Yadav) and other spinners, we figured out that we will reap benefits in the second innings. With

time, it will turn and it happened that way. Even other bowlers got help," she added.

She also praised pacers Jhulan Goswami and Shikha Pandey for bowling well up front.

"When they were three down for 114, we decided not to give up. We fielded well and bowlers like Jhulan di and Shikha backed us well. Shikha bowled very well," Bisht said.

"Jhulan di and Shikha gave breakthroughs and took key wickets. When I came in the 11th over, my target was to keep up the pressure. I did not go for wickets. The idea was to restrict runs. Initially I bowled slow, but in the second spell the wicket had dried up. Then, I bowled my normal deliveries and did not try too many variations."

London clubs reach last 16

Arsenal overcome first leg deficit to see off BATE Borisov 3-0(1); Chelsea beat Malmo in similar fashion

Arsenal and Chelsea reached the last 16 of the Europa League on Thursday after the Gunners comfortably saw off BATE Borisov 3-0 and Maurizio Sarri's troubled side relieved some of the pressure on him with the same scoreline against mediocre Malmo.

After falling 1-0 in Belarus, Arsenal was level on aggregate after just three minutes when Zakhar Volkov sliced Aubameyang's low cross past Denis Scherbitski in his own goal.

Unai Emery's side deservedly went through thanks to two thumping headers from Shkodran Mustafi and Sokratis either side of the break which put them into Friday's draw.

Ahead 2-1 from the first leg in Sweden, Chelsea had to wait until 10 minutes after the break for the first sign of excitement, Olivier Giroud tapping in the decisive goal of a humdrum encounter at Stamford Bridge.

Ross Barkley made sure of the win with a super free-kick in the 74th minute, just after Malmo's Rasmus Bengtsson was sent off for his second bookable offence, before 18-year-old Hudson-Odoi made the most of a rare start by crashing home the third.

Carlo Ancelotti's Napoli breezed to a 2-0 win over FC Zurich that saw them win 5-1 on aggregate, while Inter Milan went through 5-0 after sweeping four goals past Rapid Vienna without reply at the San Siro.

RENNES MAKE HISTORY

French side Rennes are into the last 16 of a major European tournament for the first time after winning possibly the most entertaining tie of the round 6-4 on aggregate following a barnstorming 3-1 win at Real Betis.

RB Salzburg, Dinamo Zagreb and Zenit Saint Petersburg all overturned first-leg deficits, with Austrians Salzburg hammering Club Brugge 4-0 to go through 5-2 and Croatian champions Dinamo 4-2 winners on aggregate after a storming 3-0 victory over Viktoria Plzen.

Zenit overcame Fenerbahce 3-1 in Russia, Magomed Ozdov and Sardar



Azmoun giving the hosts an aggregate lead before Mehmet Topal put the Turks ahead on away goals just before the break.

Pablo Fornals snuck Villarreal past Sporting Lisbon with a fine curling strike that gave the La Liga side a 1-1 draw on the night and a 2-1 win overall, while Benfica eased past Galatasaray

2-1 after a goalless draw in Portugal.

Krasnodar shocked Bundesliga outfit Bayer Leverkusen with a 1-1 draw that saw them through on away goals.

Eintracht Frankfurt saved Germany's blushes by sweeping past Shakhtar Donetsk with a pulsating 4-1 win that gave them side a 6-3 aggregate victory.

FIFA hands Chelsea transfer ban

LONDON: Premier League club Chelsea have been banned from signing new players in the next two transfer windows as punishment for breaking rules on registering underage players, FIFA said on Friday. It means the club — who immediately said they would appeal the decision — will be unable to make signings until the end of January next year. "The disciplinary committee sanctioned Chelsea with a ban on registering new players at both national and international level for the next two complete and consecutive registration periods," FIFA said in a statement. In addition, Chelsea were fined 600,000 Swiss francs (\$600,000, 530,000 euros) and given a period of 90 days to regularise the situation of the minor players concerned. Chelsea have been given three days to appeal against FIFA's decision, which could prove highly damaging, for example preventing the club from signing a replacement for Hazard if the star player leaves the club. Arsenal face Rennes in last 16

Arsenal will face French side Rennes in the last 16 of the Europa League, while Chelsea were paired with Dynamo Kiev in Friday's draw.

Both Premier League clubs will be at home in the first leg on Thursday, March 7, with the return matches scheduled for March 14.

Arsenal's draw means that their veteran goalkeeper Petr Cech will return to face the club he represented for two seasons before joining Chelsea in 2004.

The Brittany club finished fifth in Ligue 1 last season and are currently in mid-table, but have impressed since the 38-year-old Julien Stephan was appointed as coach in December.

Arsenal manager Unai Emery — who won the Europa League three years running as coach of Sevilla — is familiar with Rennes from his two seasons in charge of Paris Saint-Germain.

London rivals Chelsea, the other Premier League club still in the competition, might also view winning the Europa League as their most likely route into next season's Champions League.

After beating Swedish side Malmo, they might find the going tougher against Ukrainian giants Dynamo.

The clubs met in the group stage of the



Champions League in 2015-16, drawing 0-0 in Kiev before Chelsea won 2-1 at Stamford Bridge.

Elsewhere, Sevilla, who have won the trophy five times including twice in its former guise as the UEFA Cup, will face Slavia Prague.

Widely-fancied Napoli will take on the Austrian champions Salzburg, who reached the semi-finals last season.

Former European Cup finalists and UEFA Cup winners Eintracht Frankfurt were drawn against Inter Milan, who won the UEFA Cup three times in the 1990s.

Benfica face Dinamo Zagreb, while Valencia's reward for knocking out Celtic is a tie against FC Krasnodar of Russia.

That is one of two ties between Russian and Spanish sides, with Zenit Saint Petersburg drawn against Villarreal.

The final of this season's Europa League will be played in Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan, on May 29.
