# Vadra appears for ED queries

## Priyanka makes political statement by dropping husband off at ED office

PNS NEW DELHI

Congress leader Sonia Gandhi's son-in-law Robert Vadra on Wednesday appeared before the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in connection with a money laundering case for the alleged possession of illegal foreign assets. The Congress tried to tactically turn the focus away from him by having Priyanka drop her husband at the Enforcement Directorate office.

Enforcement Directorate office.
In what could be seen as a political message, Priyanka said, "I stand by my family. He is my husband, he is my family...I support my family."
Asked if it was a political vendetta, she said everyone knows why this is being done.
Priyanka's show of support to

Priyanka's show of support to her husband came days after an emotional message from Vadra on her appointment as AICC general secretary.

Vadra entered the ED office around 3.45 pm, and soon a team of his lawyers reached the ED office at Jamnagar House here. This is the first time Vadra turned up before a probe agency for questioning on charges of dubious financial dealings. However, Vadra has denied

the allegations and claimed the cases are an outcome of a

political witch-hunt. After dropping Vadra off outside the ED office, Priyanka,

who is an SPG protectee, went back in her white Toyota Land Cruiser with a convoy of vehi-cles carrying the elite com-

Vadra was directed by a Delhi court to cooperate with the ED investigation after he approached the court seeking anticipatory bail in the money laundering case. The court had asked him to appear before the ED on Wednesday on his

return from London.

A team of three ED officials asked Vadra about transactions, purchase and possession of certain immovable assets in London. His statement was recorded under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), official sources said.

The case relates to the purchase allegedly by Vadra of a London-based property located at 12, Bryanston Square worth 1.9 million GBP (British pounds). The agency had told the court that it has received the court that it has received information about various new properties in London which

belong to Vadra.

In December, the ED had raided and questioned Vadra's aide Manoj Arora, an employ-ee of Skylight Hospitality LLP, a firm linked to Vadra.

The ED has alleged that the London-based property was bought by arms dealer Sanjay Bhandari for 1.9 million GBP and sold in 2010 for the same

"This gives credence to the fact that Bhandari was not the actual owner of the prop-erty but it was beneficially owned by Vadra who was incurring expenditure on the renovation of this property," the ED had told the court. Arora, a key link in the case, was aware of Vadra's over-

# Shah has a dig at SP-BSP alliance

Hitting out at regional parties for joining hands and forging an alliance against the BJP, party president Amit Shah said that those parties had a proven record of corruption and hence they came together because of the fear of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

"Corrupt and casteist parties have formed an alliance. These parties have only region-

These parties have only regional presence and have joined hands in fear of Modiji. In 2019 elections, the BJP will get a thumping majority in UP with have the BM again." Shah told the PM again," Shah told booth-level incharges during separate meetings in Bulandshahr and Aligarh on Wednesday.

"When Sonia Gandhi left the Congress presidency, you knew that Rahul Gandhi would take up that post. But can you take up that post. But can you say who will become the president of the BJP after me? This is the BJP which believes in democracy," Shah said while adding that a tea-seller's son becoming the PM is the true reflection of a democracy.

Shah added: "In 1982, I was a booth worker pasting BJP's posters in Gujarat. The BJP has made a booth worker like me

made a booth worker like me as the national president of the party. A tea-seller's son became PM. This is possible only in the BJP. In contrast, there is a party which believes only in dynasty.

# Cabinet tightens rules to ban Ponzi schemes

Even advertising unregulated deposit schemes made unlawful; CBI armed to arrest violators

PNS NEW DELHI

The Cabinet on Wednesday approved amendments to the Banning of Unregulated Deposit Schemes Bill, 2018, and empowered the CBI to take action against violators. The amendments include ban on their advertisements.

Addressing the media, Law Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad said these comprehensive amendments would strengthen the enforcement agency and help people who are cheated by Ponzi schemes. The amendment to the Banning of regarding the timing of the Unregulated Deposits Schemes amendments and Saradha Bill 2018 is expected to be scam cases, Prasad said crim-

tabled in Parliament soon. The Bill enables creation of an online Central data base for

collection and sharing of infor-mation of deposit taking activ-ities in the country. The CBI will be nodal agency to initiate action against the violators. The Minister justified making the CBI the nodal agency and said many Ponzi schemes are operating in several States and the State police could not coor-

dinate effectively.

The Bill also added provisions to fix the cheaters who put advertisements in newspapers to fool the people. "They will be arrested immediately if they put advertisements to fool people," said Prasad. The Bill also makes provisions to retrieve the deposits, attachment of fraudsters' property,

and imprisonment.

### UP govt to table budget today

The Yogi government will table its third annual budget for 2019-20 fiscal in the Assembly on Thursday. The size of the budget is likely to be over ₹5 trillion, the largest among all states of India. The Budget session commenced on February 5 with the joint address of Governor Ram Naik address of Governor Ram Naik to both Houses of the Legislature.

Principal Secretary (Assembly) Pradeep Kumar Dubey said in Lucknow that the budget would be tabled by Finance Minister Rajesh Agarwal in the Assembly at 11 am on February. A general debate on the budget will be held between February 11 and 14. After the debate on budgetary grants, Finance Bill is likely to be passed by the Assembly on February 22. The Business Advisory Committee of the Assembly has approved the agenda of the House till February 22.

February 22. With Lok Sabha elections less than 50 days away, the Yogi government is set to present a populist budget for 2019-20.

## 7 murderers who triggered 2013 Muzaffarnagar riots held guilty

A local court on Wednesday held seven men guilty of killing two youths in Kawal vil-lage in an attack which is said to have triggered the 2013 Muzaffarnagar riots that led to the killing of over 60 people. Additional District and Sessions Judge Himashu

Bhatnagar convicted Muzammil, Mujassim, Furkan, Nadeem, Janangir, Afzal and Ikbal for killing Gaurav and Sachin on August 27, 2013, and rioting, said district prosecution counsel Rajiv Sharma.

The court will pronounce the quantum of their sentences on Friday. According to the First Information Report, the two youths of Kawal village under Jansath police station area were battered to death by the five of the seven men.

The two other accused, Afzal and Iqbal, however, were summoned by the court later under provisions of section 319 of the Criminal Procedure Code when the evidence of



their complicity in the killings emerged during the trial. The court convicted the

seven after examining 10 prosecution witnesses and six in their defence.

As per figures given by prosecution counsel Sharma, over 6,000 cases were lodged following the 2013 riots and

1.480 accused were arrested for their alleged roles in the riots.

A special investigation team, which probed the cases, had filed chargesheets in 175 cases. Fifty-six of them involving 430 accused resulted in acquittal. The State Government has withdrawn some of the cases.

# Sabarimala Board changes tack on women entry

### **SC** reserves verdict on plea to review permission order

 $T_{\text{Board, which runs}}^{\text{he Travancore Devaswom}}$ Sabarimala temple, on Wednesday made a U-turn to support the Supreme Court's order allowing women of all ages to enter the shrine as it joined the Kerala Government to oppose a batch of pleas seeking review of the historic

verdict. Meanwhile, a five-judge Constitution Bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi reserved its decision after hearing various parties for three and half hours, including those seeking re-consideration of the violent protests in Kerala.

September 28, 2018 judgment, even as the Board asserted that its latest position was not due to any political pressure.

Some right-wing activists have alleged that the Board changed its stand before the court under pressure from the state's CPI(M)-led LDF Government.

The apex court, by a majority of 4:1, had on September 28, 2018 lifted the ban on women and girls between the age of 10 and 50 from entering the famous Ayyappa shrine in Kerala and had held that this centuries-old Hindu religious practice was illegal and unconstitutional.

However, as many as 65 petitions — including 56 review petitions and four fresh writ petitions and five transfer pleas — were filed in the apex court after its verdict sparked



five-judge Constitution Bench, which had earlier agreed to hear the pleas in an open court, reserved its decision after hearing the parties, including Nair Service Society, Thantry of temple, temple Board (TDB) and the

State Government, in favour and against the review plea.

The Bench, also comprising justices RF Nariman, AM Khanwilkar, DY Chandrachud and Indu Malhotra, was in for a pleasant surprise as the temple board, which also comprises the State Government nominees, took a U-turn by supporting the SC verdict and said the people should grace-

fully accept it.

The temple board, in earlier round of litigation, had opposed the PIL by Indian Young Lawyers Association seeking to throw open the shrine for all women.

Justice Malbotra interdicts Justice Malhotra interdicted senior lawyer Rakesh

Dwivedi, appearing for TDB, and said, "You had argued against women's entry". "The Board has now decided to respect the judgment",
Dwivedi replied, adding,
"Article 25 (1) equally entitles

all persons to practice religion." Women cannot be excluded from any walk of life on biological attributes... Equality is

the dominant theme of the Constitution," Dwivedi said.

The Kerala Government,

which had taken conflicting stands on women's entry into the hilltop shrine, supported the verdict and urged the court to trash review pleas.

Senior advocate Jaideep Gupta, appearing for the State Government, said a constitutional court should not worry about law and order problem and "social disturbances".

Exclusion of women from temples is not an essential practice of Hindu religion, he said. At the outset, the Bench told lawyers it would hear only those who are parties to review petitions and asked them to confine arguments on grounds for reconsideration of the judgment. Senior advocate K Parasaran, appearing for Nair Service Society, assailed the majority verdict, saying Article 15 of the Constitution throws open for public the secular institutions of the country but

doesn't deal with religious institutions.

Seeking a reconsideration, he said the Article 17 which deals with abolition of untouchability in society was wrongly used by the court in its judgment as exclusion of certain age groups of women was not based on caste.

Parasaran also referred to the celibate or 'Naishtika Brahmachari' character of the Sabarimala deity and said the exclusionary practise was based on nature of the deity and the apex court should have con-

sidered this aspect.
He also referred to Article 25 (fundamental right to practice religion) and said unless a religious practice is "abhorrent', a court usually does not interfere with the activities associated with religious institutions.

## **Noisy walkout by opposition** over sugarcane dues

The agitated opposition L comprising the SP, BSP and Congress staged a noisy walk-out in the Assembly on Wednesday as the state government refused to commit any specific date for clearing cane dues and refused to clarify whether arrears will be paid with interest.

Sugarcane Development Minister Suresh Rana admitted that Rs 6054.23 crore were to be paid to cane farmers while replying to a short notice question by Congress leader Ajay Kumar Lalu and others in the Assembly during Question

In his reply, Rana claimed that the government had cleared Rs 34,418 crore in 2017-18, which was a record. He also said that the state government had already given a package of Rs 3,555 crore to the sugar industry which included Rs 4,000 crore as soft loan. Of this, Rs 2605 crore had been disbursed among farmers. The minister also claimed that in the last 22 months, the state government had paid Rs 52,000 crore to cane farmers.

## 1,00,078 students to appear at 113 centres

**¬**he UP Board examinations for High School and Intermediate classes conducted by the Uttar Pradesh Madhyamik Shiksha Parishad will kick off on Thursday. District Inspector of Schools (DIOS) Mukesh Singh said that a total of 1,00,078 students were appearing for the examinations at 113 centres in the district. He said that these 113 centres include the one at the Model Jail here. The High School examinations will be over in 14 days and conclude on February 28 and the Intermediate examinations will be over in 30 days and conclude

Giving details of the preparations, he said that Section 144 CrPC had already been imposed in the district. "There will be a total of 13 sector magistrates, 14 zonal magistrates, 54 static magistrates and supervisors who are second in command at 54 sensitive centres," he said. Singh said that they had a sufficient strength of invigilators and they were 5,000 in number. "We have seven flying squads which will also be monitoring the examinations," he said.

In order to prevent copying in the examinations, he said that they had installed double CCTVs in all the rooms where the examination would be conducted and a voice recorder too. "There is a control room which has been established and I have also linked the surveillance of the centres on my mobile phone so that I can monitor it when on the move. This app will be used by the other officials too," he pointed out. He said that the students were not supposed to take any electrical gadget within the rooms. "The students are now accustomed to the idea of giving an examination under the cameras. Special checking drives will be carried out on the days when cheating instances are expected to be high. We are confident that there will be no cases of cheating," he added.



## Construction of road to connect Shaheed Path with airport begins

The Uttar Pradesh Bridge Corporation (UPBC) has begun the construction work of the elevated road which will connect the Shaheed Path with the Chaudhary Charan Singh Airport. Managing director of Bridge Corporation Uttam Kumar Gehlaut, while talking to The Pioneer, said that the elevated road was being constructed at a cost of Rs 134.70 crore and its length would be 1.12 kilometres. He said that the road would be constructed from the Bangla Bazaar underpass at the Shaheed Path and would connect it with the Airport. "Now we have started the construction of the retaining wall. The existing road is under NHAI Shaheed Path and in the centre of this we are making the

two lanes on each side so that the coming and going traffic can continue." Incidentally this will go a long way in providing relief for the 1.5 kmlong stretch on the Shaheed Path where traffic snarls occur when the flights arrive.

"The road will help in decongesting the portion of the Shaheed Path at the Kanpur Road and ease the traffic here for it to go directly to the airport," he said. Secondly he pointed out that the time taken by the traffic from Hazratganj to the Airport would drastically reduce because if there was a congestion people would be in trouble and they would have to start an hour or half an hour earlier so that they

elevated road. In order to give a carriageway for the existing road we are extending it by from the Shaheed Path," he said. ## Bhule Bhatke: Reuniting Kumbh Mela's lost people since 1946

PTI ALLAHABAD

Hundreds of people mill around the Bhule Bhatke Camp', lost in the teeming crowds of the Kumbh Mela and hoping desperately to be 'found' - a familiar trope of many a Hindi film but also an everyday reality in the largest gathering on earth underway here. The humble tin settlement that is the headquarters of the camp has already 'found' 20,000 people since the Kumbh Mela started on January 15, said Umesh Tiwari whose father started the 'lost and found' movement. Many writers of the 1960s and 1970s shot to fame by penning stories themed on separation in the Kumbh Mela and unification several celluloid hours later. But it was Raia Ram Tiwari, famously known as Bhule Bhatke Ťiwari, who gave real

life to their stories. He dedicated 70 years of his life to help reunite "12,50,000 adults" and over "20,000 children" lost in Kumbh with their families, said his proud son. Tiwari Senior's success rate was close to "100 per cent", he added. And unlike the movies, a child did not have to wait for 20 years to meet

his or her parents or siblings. "Sometimes it could take days and sometime it was just matter of some hours. My father, in most cases, did manage to reunite lost people with their families. When he couldn't help the lost person, he would take the help of police," Umesh told PTI.

The formula for success, devised way back in 1946, continues in this digital age with loudspeakers blaring out the names of those queuing up outside - and inside the camp.

# **Was Rahul behind coup story: BJP**

## Massive drive to fill over 76K posts in CAPF: Govt

PNS NEW DELHI

The Union Home Ministry has launched a massive recruitment drive to fill 76,578 vacancies, including 7,646 posts for women, in Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs).

In a statement on Wednesday, the Home Ministry said out of these vacancies, 54,953 posts are for the constable cadre and they will be hired through the Staff Selection Commission

Out of the 54,953 posts of constables, the CRPF, the world's largest paramilitary force, has the maximum 21,566 vacancies, followed by the BSF (16,984 posts), the SSB (8,546 posts), the ITBP (4,126 posts) and the Assam Rifles (3,076 posts) with the remaining being in the CISF and other

For the entire exercise, the SSC will start a computerbased written examination from this month itself, the statement said

The CRPF, which has a strength of 325 operational battalions (3,25,000 personnel) will get nearly 22 more battalions (22,000 personnel approximately). The CRPF is a designated anti-Naxal, counterterror and anti-insurgency Central Force.

The paramilitary is heavideployed in Jammu and Kashmir, Naxal areas and the Northeast.

The addition of the 22 battalions will give a boost to the Force that has for long been deprived of the reserve component, leading to fatigue amongst personnel due to continuous deployment in hard

After the completion of the recruitment, the personnel will be able to get soft postings like training and the areas not hit by insurgency or terror. There are 1,073 vacancies

in various CAPFs at the level of Sub-Inspector, out of which 38 posts are reserved for women. The BSF has the maximum 508 vacancies of SI, followed by the and the ITBP (85). Direct Recruitment for these posts also will be made by the SSC through a written examination between February-March.

At the level of the Assistant Commandant, there exist 466 vacancies for which direct recruitment is being made through the UPSC. The result of the written examination to fill these posts has been declared on January 1.

The shortlisted candidates will appear for physical and medical examination to be conducted by the Sashatra Seema Bal (SSB), the nodal force, from February 25

In addition, 20,086 vacancies pertain to promotional posts and in other cadres such as tradesman, ministerial, medical, paramedical, communication and engineering and these are also being filled by the

Thus, in all 76,578 vacancies are getting filled up, the statement added.

"Not less than 50 per cent of the members of the Lokpal shall be from amongst the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, minorities and women," the advertisement seeking the applications

Upon selection, the chairperson and members shall hold office for a term of five years or till they attain 70 years of age.

The salary and allowances of the chairman of the Lokpal will be same as that of the Chief Justice of India. The members will be paid salary and allowances same as that of a judge of the Supreme Court.

Apolls this year, the Ministry of Finance's Public Investment Board (PIB) on Wednesday approved metro rail projects of Agra, Kanpur, Ahmedabad phase II and Patna besides the Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut Rapid Rail Transit corridor.

Meanwhile, the Delhi Government once again made it clear that its share of ₹1138 crore towards the project cost has to be borne by the Centre as it did not have adequate funds. The question thus reminas as to who will pay the share of Delhi Government, sources

Sources in the Government said that financial implications of the aforementioned metro rail projects have been approved. The proposals would be sent to the Union Cabinet for approval.

On the Delhi-Ghaziabd-Meerut corridor of RRTS, Delhi government

has written to Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs that proposed change in alignment of the project as well as change of station at Sarai Kale Khan from underground to elevated would affect the construction plan of ISBT Sarai Kale Khan and the proposed hotel under the PPP mode to fund the redevelopment of the ISBT. This will lead to delay in the entire project. According to sources, the after refusing the share the project cost by the Delhi Government, the question arise whether the Centre will pay the share of Delhi Government.

The metro rail project of Patna will cost ₹13,400 crore. As per the DPR, the 14.5km east-west corridor will cover Saguna Mor, Bailey Road, Patna Junction and Mithapur bus stand. The 16.5km north-south corridor, on the other hand, will connect Patna Junction with the proposed bus stand at Barriya via Ashok Rajpath, Gandhi Maidan and Rajendra Nagar terminal. While the



east-west corridor will mostly be underground, the north-south corridor will be elevated.

For Kanpur and Agra metro, the Uttar Pradesh government had reduced the cost of the projects after the Ministry of Housing and Úrban Affairs's objection. For the Kanpur project, a proposal of ₹18,143 crore was sent earlier. Now

it has been made ₹10,908 crores.

A total of 32.385 km of metro rail will be built in Kanpur. As per the revised DPR, two corridors will be built under the Kanpur Metro project. The proposed metro rail of Kanpur city will cover IIT, Rawatpur, Bada Chauraha, Motimahal, Kanpur Central, ISBT Jhakarkatti and Naubasta. The Agra metro project cost was estimated to ₹13,781 crores. Now it has been made ₹8,262 crores. A 30 km metro rail network is to be built in Agra which will

consist two corridors. The Ahmedabad metro phase II projects will cost Rs 7500 crore. As per the revised DPR for phase-II, the route length has been shortened to 28.26 km. ## Linkage of PAN with Aadhaar is mandatory for filing IT return: SC

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

The Supreme Court has said **⊥** that linkage of PAN with Aadhaar is mandatory for filing of Income Tax returns.

A bench comprising Justices A K Sikri and S Abdul Nazeer said the top court has already decided the matter and upheld the section 139AA of the Income Tax Act. The court's direction came on an appeal filed by the Centre against a Delhi High Court order allowing two persons, Shreya Sen and Jayshree Satpute, to file Income Tax returns for 2018-19 without linking their Aadhaar and PAN numbers.

"The aforesaid order was passed by the High Court having regard to the fact that the matter was pending consideration in this Court. Thereafter, this Court has decided the matter and upheld the vires of section 139AA of the "We therefore make it clear that for the assessment year 2019-20, the income tax return shall be filed in terms of the judgment passed by this court. The special leave petition is disposed of in

Income Tax Act. In view thereof, linkage of PAN with Aadhaar is mandatory," the bench said.

The top court noted that with regard to Assessment Year 2018-19, it has been informed that the two petitioners had filed the Income Tax returns in terms of the orders of the High Court and the assessment has also been completed. "We therefore make it clear that for the assessment year 2019-20, the income tax return shall be filed in terms of the judgment passed by this court. Blasting off from Ariane Launch Complex at Kourou, a French territory located in northeastern coast of South America at at 2.31 am (IST), the Ariane-5 vehicle of the European launch services provider Arianespace injected the "high power" satellite into the orbit in a flawless flight that lasted about 42 minutes.

With a mission life of 15 years and weighing about 2,536 kg, GSAT-31 is the country's 40th communication satellite to be built by the Indian Space Research Organisation(ISRO) and will provide continuity to operational services on some of the in-orbit satellites

'It gives me great pleasure on the successful launch of GSAT-31 spacecraft on board Orbit, ISRO said.

Ariane-5," ISRO's Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) Director S Pandian said at Kourou soon after the launch.

'Congratulation Arianespace on the successful launch and precise injection of satellite into the orbit," he

The GSAT-31 is a "high power" communication satellite with Ku-band, and it is going to serve and replace some of the satellites that are going to expire soon, he said.

Arianespace Stéphane Israël tweeted: "2019 is off to a roaring start for #Arianespace! Flight #VA247, carrying Saudi Geostationary Satellite 1/Hellas Sat 4 and GSAT-31, is a confirmed success that underscores our leadership position in the geostationary launch market. @KACŚT #HellasSat @ISRO @LockheedMartin."

The Ariane-5 vehicle (Flight VA247) also carried Saudi Geostationary Satellite 1/Hellas Sat 4 along with GSAT-31.

The Indian satellite, which will provide communication services to Indian mainland and islands, will also augment the Ku-band transponder capacity in Geostationary

India's 40th communication satellite GSAT-31, built by ISRO, was successfully launched by the Ariane 5 VA-247 heavy duty rocket from Kourou in French Guiana on Feb 5, 2019. It will

replace INSAT-4CR, which is nearing the end of its mission life Applications GSAT-31 will be used for supporting VSAT networks.

## Army 'detains' 3 soldiers to probe Shaurya Chakra Aurangzeb's killing links

The Indian Army has detained three soldiers of Jammu & Kashmir Light Infantry (JAKLI) to probe their involvement in a conspiracy to reveal whereabouts of their colleague Lance Naik Aurangzeb who was killed by terrorists in south Kashmir on June 14.
Affiliated with 44

Rashtriya Rifles unit, Aurangzeb, who was posthumously awarded Shaurya Chakra on Independence Day last year, was travelling to his native place in a private vehicle on eve of Eid when terrorists waylaid the vehicle and kidnapped him.

Sources said the trio is being quizzed to know if they somehow leaked information about Aurangzeb's movement out of his battalion headquarters in a private vehicle. Aurangzeb was known for his counterinsurgency offensive in the area and his proximity with an Army officer who has commanded several successful operations against militants including killing of Sameer Tiger, a top-ranking commander of Hizbul Mujahideen.

Aurangzeb's vehicle was waylaid by terrorists at Qalampora village and in a short duration his body was found by a team of police and Army officials at Gussu village. A video of his kidnapping was

also released by his abductors. Media reports earlier claimed that Aurangzeb's whereabouts were leaked by a local woman who had allegedly developed a relationship



with him.

The three soldiers Abid Hussain Wani, Tajamul Ahmed and Adil Wani were his colleagues. They are all local residents.

The Army has not reacted to the reports about the detention and questioning of the soldiers. The detention came to fore after a youngster Abid Tauseef Wani was allegedly tortured by an Army officer in Shadimarg camp. Former Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti went to see Wani at Sri Maharaja Hari Singh Hospital (SMHS) and accused an Army officer for torturing the youngster.

A relative of Wani said they have lost touch with Abid since June and the Army is not telling them anything about his whereabouts. "We are wor-ried now. They (Army) also called Tawseef and tortured him inside the camp. They were asking about his involvement in the killing of Aurangzeb," he said.

Aurangzeb was posthumously awarded Shaury Chakra while as Defence Minister Nirmala Sitharaman trekked a long distance to travel to his native village in mountainous Poonch district to pay homage.

Pandalam royal family, the custodian of the Sabarimala temple's jewellery, on Wednesday slammed the Travancore Devaswom Board (TDB) for changing its opinion and now supporting the entry of all women to the hilltop shrine.

After the TDB announced its stand in the Supreme Court as it heard numerous review petitions against its September 28 verdict lifting the ban on entry of women of all ages to the Lord Ayyappa temple, the royal family's spokesperson PS Verma said the "true colours" of the TDB had been revealed.

They have toed the line of the Kerala Government. When they earlier said they are with the wishes and aspirations of the Sabarimala devotee, it was all a bluff.

"Today their true colours have surfaced and this means both the government and the TDB are out to destroy the customs and traditions of the Sabarimala temple," he said.

Noting the court had now decided to give another seven days for written submissions. Verma alleged that this means that the temple premises were going to witness another showdown when it opens for the monthly pujas on February 12.

"So as far as we are concerned, we have not lost hope as we feel that if there is going to be another setback, there is an option to file a curative peti-



tion. We will go to any extent to protect the traditions and customs of the temple," he added. TDB president A. Padmakumar denied the board

had changed its stand.

"We did not file a review petition. Instead we filed a 'delay petition' (requesting the court to defer the judgment). today we were asked about our stand in relation to the September 28 verdict.

'It was to this that our counsel said that they will abide by the court verdict. The court has also given time till February 13 to give in writing if there are any more things that should be brought before the court.

We will meet to discuss on what needs to be given in writing," said Padmakumar, a for-

mer CPI-M legislator.

"The TDB will abide by whatever the verdict is," he said. Asked if there was a shift in the stand, the TDB reminded the media that the Bharativa Janata Party's organ had soon after the September 28 verdic ran a headline hailing it as "historic". Former Chief Minister and Congress leader Oommen Chandy said the TDB's somersault showed that it was hand in glove with the Pinarayi Vijavan Government.

"Just what Vijayan wanted, the TDB has done," he said. State BJP president PS Sreedharan Pillai said Vijayan has taken everyone for a ride.

## Assam Budget proposes 1 tola gold to brides, rice at ₹1!

Guwahati: Assam Finance Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Wednesday presented a ₹1,193 crore deficit budget for 2019-20 with no fresh taxes and introducing new schemes like providing rice to poor at ₹1 a kg and gold for brides.

The budget also proposed to provide financial assistance to students, including girls from the minority community. With an opening balance of minus ₹1,799.84 crore, the budget proposed to have trans-actions of ₹606.80 crore during 2019-20, Sarma told the House on Wednesday.

Sarma said for special category States like Assam, com-

are required to register for Goods and Services Tax (GST). However, to give succour to small businesses and considering the small base, the government has raised the GST threshold limit to ₹20 lakh following approval of the GST Council effective February 1, 2019.

households in Assam covering a total population of 2.46 crore.



"We shall give one tola gold, costing around ₹38,000 as of today, to brides belonging to all such communities of our state where it is customary to provide gold at the time of wedding under the Arundhati scheme," he said.

The scheme can be availed by formal registration of the marriages under the Special Marriage (Assam) Rules, 1954 and will reach the beneficiaries at the time of marriage, he said.

Also, around 48 per cent of respondents were unaware about the mode of anthrax transmission as a result they often hide skin sis and leading to further spread. Mainly a disease of cattle, anthrax can be passed off to humans where it manifests in three forms- cutaneous (skin), pulmonary (respiratory) and intestinal. If untreated, risk of death from cutaneous

anthrax can go as high as 25

per cent and for the other varieties the risk of death might be up to 75 per cent, even with treatment.

The State Government seems to be least bothered about this rising health hazard. The scientists pointed out that there was a lack of interdepartmental co-ordination, vacant posts at grass-root level in veterinary department, and absence of regular anthrax vaccination programmes.

"It is found that mainly

health department along with veterinary department work together during the outbreak but other departments like forest, block administration only attend the meeting during the outbreaks and never part of the control measures for anthrax. Outbreaks gain attenhuman," said the survey.

As per National Animal Diseases Referral Expert System (NADRES) data, anthrax is one of the top 10 diseases reported in India and one of the major causes of deaths in livestock with high case fatality rate.

## 1st victim in Delhi this year, advisory issued

Around 124 fresh cases, including 104 adults and 20 children, of seasonal influenza H1N1, including a death, were recorded in the national Capital on Tuesday, taking the total number of cases in Delhi to 1,019, said a report.

According to the national data released by National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), around 1,011 cases were recorded till Monday without any death. A senior official from Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) informed the media that out of 1,011 cases, only 895 cases belonged to Delhi, which included 712 adults and 183 children, and the rest were from other States. Interestingly, till Monday, the Delhi Government had not reported any death due to swine flu this year, but on Tuesday, the report said one death was recorded.

On the contrary, two major hospitals in Delhi, namely Safdarjung Hospital and Ram Manohar Lohia (RML) Hospital, recorded 13 deaths collectively last year. A senior doctor at Safdarjung Hospital confirming the data said, "From January 1 to January 31, around three deaths have been reported at our hospital."

In January, around 23 cases of H1N1 influenza were reported by the hospital, he said. During the same time period, around 10 fatalities were reported from RML Hospital.

A senior official of DGHS said the deaths which are being reported by the hospitals occur due to other factors and not just because of swine flu alone. "It is not confirmed weather the deaths are happening due to swine flu or due to some other factors. The patients who have died might have some other diseases already and the influenza worsened the condition," she said. The virus itself is not capable of killing someone, she added. Patients with co-morbid condition like low immunity, on immune suppressant, blood cancer, renal transplant, diabetes, heart disease are at high risk of getting infected with swine flu. With this, Delhi has become second largest city to record seasonal influenza H1N1 this year. Last year, only 205 cases of the disease were reported in the Capital. Showing concerns, the Delhi Government's Health Department issued a health advisory on Wednesday. The symptoms may include body aches, headache, fatigue, chills, diarrhoea and vomiting and Blood Stained Sputum (a mixture of mucus and saliva), it said further.

## 500 fishermen in Pak custody: Govt

fishermen and more than 1,050 Indian fishing boats are believed to be in Pakistan's custody, the Government said on Wednesday. This includes 179 Indian prisoners and fishermen who were repatriated from Pakistan in 2018, he said. According to the available information, 503 Indian fishermen are believed to be in Pakistan's custody, the Pakistan's custody, he said.

Pakistan, through a list shared on January 1, 2019, has acknowledged the custody of 483 fishermen who are Indian or believed-to-be-Indian in their jails, Singh said. The 483 fishermen includes those who are in Pakistan for over 20 months. The Government has asked Pakistan to provide consular access and early release and repatriation of the remaining Indian prisoners and fishermen along with their boats in

More than 1,050 Indian fishing boats are believed to be in Pakistan's custody, Singh said. However, he said Pakistan has not acknowledged their custody so far. Responding to a question on whether the Government has recently received any representations regarding alleged attacks by Sri Lankan Navy on Indian fishermen and capture of their properties, Singh said the Government has received letters from the State Governments of Tamil Nadu and Puducherry and also from

there have been occasions when the arrested Indian fishermen have complained of assault by Sri Lanka Navy, the Minister said. The fishermen issues have been raised at the highest level, including by Prime Minister Narendra Modi with his Lankan counterpart Ranil Wickremesinghe during the latter's visit to India in October 2018. To another question, Singh also informed the Lower House that 4,705 Indian nationals are in prisons in Gulf countries, which also includes Indian origin labourers imprisoned due to accidents. Replying to another question, Singh said the total number of Indians who have completed their jail terms but are still lodged in prisons of foreign countries is 434, out of which 396 Indians are in Pakistan.

The armed forces and its soldiers are suffering thanks to decades of political wrangling over major acquisitions



t is the lot of a warrior that he/she knows that he/she might die in a bat-Itle, something that is understood by their families as well. However, for soldiers to die in accidents, ones that are very often preventable during peacetime, is completely unacceptable and a needless waste of human life and resources. The death of two squadron leaders of the Indian Air Force (IAF) in an accident in Bengaluru is just one such case. In the past, Indian Navy vessels have had issues while at port and old Army equipment has failed, killing many of our soldiers. A touching poem

by Garima Abrol, the wife of Samir Abrol, one of the pilots killed, high-

lighted how Indian soldiers have to make do with painfully old equipment. One thing that has to be laid out though is that even the most advanced armed forces in the world use old equipment. The backbone of the United States' Air Force's strategic bomber fleet is the B-52 that entered service in the late 1950s and the examples flying today are close to 60 years old. The US plans to keep the planes flying until 2050. This makes it obvious that even the richest countries in the world have to keep their military assets going for a really long time as equipment is very expensive, particularly in today's era of electronic warfare and precision munition. But that does not take away the fact that much of India's military equipment is painfully old and obsolete. There has been an inability by successive Governments to seriously acquire new hardware. It is also worth noting that India remains the world's largest military importer with its outdated ideas of procurement as well as problems in building a proper military-industrial complex where military hardware can be manufactured in-house. India's defence research, manufacturing and even upgradation have been woeful other than in developing missiles. The Arjun Tank and the Tejas light combat aircraft are but two examples of failure. While the Narendra Modi Government did try to promote more Indian companies under the 'Make in India' scheme, such a programme would always have led to accusations of corruption or favouritism and in the case of Rafale, they have. The inability of the Government to take the Opposition in confidence on the need to build indigenous military manufacturing capacity in the Indian private sector has been a major reason for the failure.

With elections nearing and the need to fund social sector schemes to alleviate poverty gaining momentum despite two well-armed neighbours and constant threats, India finds itself in a bind that few other nations do when it comes to security in the region. India has to be prepared for the eventuality of a two-front war and that needs investment in new military equipment and better management of existing resources. While affording equipment is a challenge, we cannot afford to lose lives needlessly. The next Government and the Opposition have to keep this in mind.

## Taj still top draw

Our heritage sites are a source of revenue but it's time we engage with private conservators for their upkeep



■ ttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath may not agree that the Taj Mahal is intrinsic to Indian culture but it has topped the list of monuments with the highest revenue between 2015 and 2018. Going by Culture Minister Mahesh Sharma's statement in the Rajya Sabha, the others in the top 10 include Agra Fort, Red Fort, Qutub Minar, Sun Temple in Konark. Mamallapuram. Ellora caves, the Khajuraho temples and the Ajanta caves in Aurangabad. Of course, the bigger question is that despite their popularity

and the Archaeological Survey of India's (ASI's) year on year increase in expenditure, some of these have already made the headlines for their dismal state of maintenance. As for the pollutant-beaten Tai Mahal, we only seem to take note of it when the Supreme Court desperately appeals to our national conscience in its several rulings. Then there is the larger issue of crowd behaviour with Indians prone to engraving their own legacy on historical facades. There have been reports of old stones, friezes and statues being stolen and sold from sprawling complexes of the Sun Temple at Konark and the limb by limb decimation of figures in Ajanta and Ellora. Clearly, the resource-strapped ASI is finding it difficult to be a custodian and conservator.

Which is why there is no harm in engaging in private-public partnerships for ensuring upkeep. Countries like Italy, Egypt and around the Mediterranean have sought resource and management sharing with private majors like fashion houses and soft drink conglomerates. Varanasi's *ghats* have been cleaned up and made presentable without tarnishing their cultural essence and ancient feel by private hotel chains. Delhi's citizens have found summer evenings pleasurable again with the restoration of the Humayun's tomb complex and the Sundar Nursery by the Aga Khan Trust. Both these heritage sites and the extended Nizamuddin Basti improvement project have not only restored Mughal architecture and gardens to their pristine glory but encouraged soirees, cultural confluences and most importantly, restored the city's biodiversity hotspots. Many private players have restored Delhi's *havelis*, converting them to heritage homestays. The big museum trusts around the world seek voluntary participation by experts and the community alike. And though critics may claim that corporates were encashing the footfalls while doing CSR, claiming tax benefits and were not entirely altruistic, fact is that signages or hoardings proclaiming their contribution have been limited to areas outside the core heritage arc. The privately run, family-owned Rajasthan forts have boosted the tourist economy and generated more resources for upkeep through specially curated walks and inner chamber access. PPP ventures have resulted in rescuing lost gems like the Nahargarh fort. Imagine a cleaned up Meena Bazaar elevated to the status of the Grand Bazaar of Istanbul. Of course, any private initiative has to be monitored and implemented by an expert committee under the supervision of the ASI. This should have multiple representation of historians, conservationists, archaeologists and keeper family trusts. The execution can be entrusted to those with a proven track record and depth of expertise. Heritage is our badge of honour and the more participatory we make it, the better we will respect and keep it.

# An alternate universe

While the free world might have heaved a sigh of relief at the final acquittal of Aasia Bibi, she was just one example of continued victimisation by Pakistan's blasphemy laws

ibi Aasia Noreen, the Pakistani Christian woman who was on death row for blasphemy, is finally out of the woods. The Supreme Court of Pakistan recently rejected the final appeal against her acquittal. But she might still have to relocate to the West, as living in Pakistan could prove perilous for her. India could have set an example by inviting her to live in this country.

Imagine if Aasia Bibi were a Christian woman in India, working in an agricultural field alongside Hindu women. Consider a hypothetical scenario. Thirsty after working under the hot sun, she fetches a pail of water for fellow workers, but first drinks some herself from the metal mug lying beside the well. The other women, suddenly realising that she is a Christian, wonder whether Aasia Bibi had "polluted" their well and "diluted" their religion. And then, angered and hurt, Aasia Bibi reacts by telling some horrible things about Hindu deities as though she had been read-ing BR Ambedkar's *Riddles in Hinduism*: The Annotated Critical Selection the pre-

What options would Hindu women have against Aasia Bibi? First, a cat-fight to teach her a lesson on the spot. Second, tell the owner of the land to dismiss her from services. Third, to complain to their respective husbands about the defilement. Fourth, to tell the priest about a local temple. Fifth, go to Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) karyakartas. Sixth, to go to the law enforcing authorities like police and court.

The third and fourth options would have been treated as nothing more than gossip-mongering. Also, since Aasia Bibi is not a Bible-thumping Christian missionary, there would be little to excite the RSS and VHP karyakartas. The fifth option of approaching the law enforcing authorities would be positively dangerous for them as they would be hauled up under Section 3 of the Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955, to enforce religious disabilities (denying access to water sources). Thus, rather than doing any harm to Aasia Bibi, they themselves would have ended up in prison for up

to six months besides depositing a penalty. But on June 14, 2009, Aasia Bibi was unfortunately in an alternate universe called Pakistan. She was arrested on charges of making derogatory remarks about of Mafia Bibi and Asma Bibi. Qari Mohammed Salam, a local cleric, filed a case of blasphemy with the police, based on hearsay. The case spiralled in importance with a local court awarding death sentence to Aasia Bibi for denigrating Prophet Mohammed in 2010, and later a Lahore court upholding its judgement in 2016.

The Pakistan Penal Code has several controversial sections (and sub sections thereof) ranging from 295 to 298-C under



commonly called "blasphemy laws" that are discriminatory against non-Muslims. The most dangerous of them are 295-C (use of derogatory remarks with respect to Prophet Mohammed) and 295-B (defiling the Holy Quran) which carry a punishment of mandatory death sentence and life imprisonment respectively.

Some of these deadly provisions were inserted in Pakistan's Penal Code not when the Islamic Republic was founded but in the 1980s, when the rest of the world was seized with the idea of progress. Pakistan had inherited some blasphemy laws from the British period but those were religion-neutral. Their basic purpose was not to defend religious principles but maintain communal peace.

In three decades between 1947 and 1977, there were only 10 reported court judgements in Pakistan pertaining to offences against religion. The complaints were made mostly Muslims, by non-Muslims against Muslims. No case was registered by a Muslim against non-Muslims for committing an act of blasphemy against Prophet Mohammed or "defiling" the Quran. But all these was about to change soon.

In 1974, when Zulfikar Ali Bhutto was the Prime Minister, the first amendment in the was carried out to exclude the Ahmediyas from the legal definition of being a Muslim. The language of the amendment had a theological overtone incompatible with modern constitutions. It says that a person, who does not believe in the absolute and unqualified finality of the prophethood of the Mohammed, is not a Muslim for the purpose of the Constitution or law.

In 1977, General Zia-ul Haq came to power through a coup d'état. The ensuing 11 saw increased vears Íslamisation of Pakistan in various spheres. These included insertion of five provisions relating to blasphemy in the Pakistan Penal Code between 1980 and 1986. Close to 1,500 people have been charged under those sections till date though none were actually

A Federal Shariat Court (FSC) was established in 1980, with the power to "examine and decide the question whether repugnant to the injunctions of Islam". The FSC's decisions are binding upon the Government unless the latter successfully appeals to the Shariat bench of the Supreme Court.

When Section 295-C was introduced in 1986, it had a provision of life imprisonment as an alternative to capital punishment. But in 1990, the FSC alternative provision of life imprisonment. Since the Pakistan Government did not appeal against this recommendation in the Supreme Court by the deadline of April 30, 1991, the capital punishment without an alternative attained finality.

A judgement of Peshawar High Court in 2006 expressed serious concern that whenever a person was charged with such an offence, the media gave extensive coverage and the accused person was abused by the society/people at large. Even under Islamic injunctions, the court added, it is for the Qazi alone to decide the guilt or innocence of the accused and none could be allowed to forejudge and condemn any person accused of such offence without facing proper and fair trial.

Right to fair trial is what the Supreme Court based its case upon in its judgements (dated October 7, 2015, and January, 28, 2019). But unfortunately, the court could not discard or of blasphemy laws. This means there will be no end to this madness in Pakistan. The courts could not counteract blasphemy because they know it is an integral part of Islam. Its misuse though has been possi-

bly as old as its application itself. Nicholas Mannucci (1638-1717), the Italian adventurer to India, relates in his Storia do Aleppo (Syria) outwitted a Muslim Governor, who wanted to deprive him of his wealth, life and religion by abetting blasphemy in the 16th century. # A sentence of death by torture

It is disheartening that despite strong animal protection laws in place, live export of cattle is a thriving business in India. We have to protect them

busing animals for human benefit dates back to centuries with supreme leaders form one community using animals as barter to prove their loyalty towards an influential leader. Horses for cavalry, sheep, goats, cows and even the rarest of deer were presented to leaders for food and clothing. Open murders of these animals were a common sight and with the lack of any laws protecting them from this enormous cruelty, there was no way they could be saved. The 17th century saw a growth in animal trade during the Mughal regime. Horses were transported by sea to please the interest of Mughal rulers, from as far as Persia and some Arabian countries. The Jahangirnama records the arrival of Mugarrab Khan in court to pay homage in 1610. He brought many Abyssinian slaves and Arabian horses for the then supreme leader of the country. It was believed that if six horses were sent to be transported, only one would survive to be gifted to the emperors. These animals were never likely to survive in abnormally harsh journeys they were sent on.

Today, centuries later, there are some laws and rules which protect animals from such torture but the situation remains largely the same. Maybe horses have been spared for the time being, but goats, sheep and cows are still traded and they are exported in horrific conditions of abysmal torture to countries where poor or no current laws of animal protection and welfare exist. Animals are transported by sea or air, treated as mere commodities and thrown into these flights of shame.

Thousands of sheep, goats and cows, trapped in a moving ship inside loose containers, face exhaustion with little food and water to survive the dreadful journeys. Many animals don't make it — they die due to trauma, heat strokes, dehydration, injuries, fatigue and diseases they catch on their way. All animals, who die during the course of the journey, are dumped into the ocean. The transportation chambers are never cleaned, thus leaving animals to lie in their own faeces — and this is just the tip of the iceberg. Lack of any veterinary care on board the ship/flight and the lack of any inspection on the way these animals are exported leave them at the mercy of exporters, giving the brokers an opportunity to bend laws as per their convenience. No cameras are allowed inside the ship and exporters make it a point to hide the manner in which these animals are transported from one country to another.

In India, the law recognises that it is the fundamental duty of every citizen and that of the state to protect and show compassion for the environment, wildlife and all living creatures. Yet, exporting animals in our country is not only unethical but also effectively illegal as these animals are subject to cruelty as defined by the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 (PCA). Export of live animals defeats the purpose of the Act, which is to prevent unnecessary pain and suffering on animals. None of the export rules and procedures made by the Government specifies how animals are to be exported. In the current socio-political environment in the country, the Government — both State and Central and pressure groups like animal NGOs and the Jain Samaj — have different opinions on the way animals are to be treated. The issue then is no longer for the animals but for vested interests of each stakeholder involved in the process.

This has presented us an opportunity to speak for the animals used in live export, to the top of our voices, and bring forth the visible torture they go through on these journeys of death. With continuous uproar in the public to stop this cruel practice once and for all, the Federation of Indian Animal Protection Organisations (FIAPO) has campaigned to 'stop live export of animals' across the country. Despite having strong animal protection laws, live export on the part of India is a mockery of the lives of these animals as well as the laws. We have to protect them. Recently, more than 3,000 sheep were transported from Nashik Airport, which brought together several activists and animal lovers. FIAPO has asked the Chief Minister of Maharashtra to ban the practice of live export like in the State of Gujarat. While we make resolutions for a bright new year, thousands of animals in live export face the darkest phase of their lives. Putting money ahead of animals' pain is unethical on several grounds. Animals are not iron or wheat. They are sentient souls who cannot protest against what happens to them. Handing them to individuals or groups, that have no concern of animal welfare, on to ships or flights with no special facility to carry them is completely immoral and effectively illegal. The Government needs to recognise, take a note of this and put an end to this extremely cruel practice.

# Sabarimala and the way ahead

For the Marxists, it's a do-or-die battle in Kerala. The shrine row is but a ploy to stop the consolidation of Hindu votes. But it can't dilute *Sanatana Dharma*

t was expected that the fury and furore generated by the Sabarimala imbroglio would subside with the seasonal closing of the shrine. But controversy has resurfaced and resulted in a public outcry in Kerala once again. The latest provocation for the Hindus was the news widely publicised that the affidavit submitted by the lawyers of the Marxist Government of Kerala — that contained the names of women below the age of 50, who entered the Sabarimala shrine — is a fabricated list of lies. It has names of men and women over 50 years of age, whose age has been deliberately reduced and also the name of a woman, whose address cannot be traced. A heap of lies concocted by the

A heap of lies concocted by the Government is beginning to get exposed. But the question of larger significance, which more and more Hindus are asking themselves, that too vocally now is: Why this haste to reform our rituals alone? Why resort to lies, police brute force and false propaganda to demolish Hindu faith?

Marxism and Hinduism in Kerala: Marxism anywhere cannot be tolerant of religion. But in Kerala (and in West Bengal too) the party confronted an Indian reality. They could not attack the faith of the organised religions who had well-established vote banks. In Kerala, therefore, Hindu faith became the primary object of derision. In this task, they always had the unstinted support of the Westernbiased media.

Sanatana dharma and Marxism: As the erudite Purohit Swami wrote in his autobiography, "Civilisations superstructure may be very fine indeed but it totters like a house of cards, for the everlasting kingdom is established in man's hearts and not an inevitable denouement outwardly to dazzle these eyes." Marxist Governments in USSR, Czechoslovakia, Yugoslavia and East European countries did totter like a pack of cards because they did not improve the inner man.

Marxism and social maladies: Hindu youths have been the most vulnerable targets for this loss of values and Marxist indoctrination. If weaned away from religious moorings, youth become rebellious and Marxist ideology can then be easily driven into such discontented minds. In northern Kerala, these unemployed and under-employed youth are being used as volunteers to carry out the political murder.

The intellectual pauperism: Sloganeering and repetitions of cliché have stunted independent thinking minds in the State. "Idiotically pompous" that is what most people have been reduced to by the communists' propaganda. They vainly mouth fascism, sangh *parivar*, renaissance (*navodhanam*) or any other phraseology coined by the communist bandwagon. While Vedantic traditions and faith hold through time, the communists are flogging a dead ideology.

Sabarimala and its unique tradition: Sabarimala has always been a temple that was intended to instill qualities of renunciation, peace and *bramhacharya*. A 41-day period of discipline regarding diet restriction, sleep



control and celibacy is followed by the devotees as they prepare for a visit to the holy shrine. Once they put on the bead garland, they are called *swamys*, suggesting they are worthy of respect. When the devotee reaches Sabarimala, he is better qualified to realise the ultimate truth, *tatvam asi* (thou art that) inscribed at the entrance of the temple. Sabarimala is not just a place of worship, it is a nursery for those desirous, who follow the path of yoga. It is for this very reason that the unique tradition of Sabarimala needs to be preserved.

Yogic traditions and media lies: Can't the

women too practise these very virtues and discipline? They can, and it for this very reason that all temples, including the temple of Ayyappa, are open to women of all ages. The Sabarimala idol is conceived by the devotees as a naishtika brahmachari, a youth who has confor God's realisation. He is depicted as sitting in a unique posture, yoga pattasana, which tantric science says is conducive for the arousal of the Kundalini Shakti. If one observes the idol, with even a rudimentary knowledge of tantra and yoga (the writer claims nothing more), it can be seen that in this posture of sitting, pressure is put on the mooladhara chakra and the lower energy centres of the body. This posture is unique and Ayyappa idol at Sabarimala is the only deity depicted in this posture.

Is the total sublimation of the vital energy, conceived in the idol, ideally suited to be worshipped by women of reproductive age?

To denounce esoteric religious practices in terms of modern-day rationality would be as absurd as dismissing the bread and wine taken by the faithful Christians during Eucharist as being bakery items of gastronomical delights or giving a biological explanation to the virgin's motherhood of Christ.

Romo Rolland knew the dangers of state interference in spiritual matters and he was

prompted to say that had Shri Rama Krishna Paramahansa been born in the West, he would have been subjected to shock treatments.

Gender and Sabarimala: If my right to swing my walking stick ends where your nose begins, then the feminist bandwagon should realise that the right place to swing their walking stick is not the Sabarimala shrine. The faithful women devotees of Kerala realise this unique nature of the deity and this is the reason why they spontaneously carried out rallies against Government interference in Sabarimala. The faithful respect the right to worship for others and Sabarimala is the only temple (one or two local exceptions apart) where age restriction for women is followed.

The feminists, who still insist on swinging their walking sticks at other worshippers' noses, are State-sponsored activists of various hues. Many have shady pasts, police cases pending against them and have Maoist affiliations too. When the State Government manipulates the list of young women, who have already entered the temple premise, it was the culmination of a large game plan that divine intervention has exposed.

Gender, Sabarimala and some common sense: Gender parity is a pre-requisite for the functioning of democracy. There are times when you have to give Caesar what is his due and to God what is due to him. But again, who shall decide where Caesar's domain ends and God's begin? Justice Indu Malhotra said in her dissenting note that the judiciary itself should not judge matters of spiritual significance.

Media and the propaganda of lies: Ayyappa is no misogynist, nor is his celibacy under threat if women visit the shrine. Neither Ayyappa nor his devotees have contempt for menstruating women or consider them unclean. These are arguments concocted by Western-biased media and the communist propaganda machinery. If the true signif-

icance of Sabarimala's rituals and tradition is to be understood, surely it has to be by using the semantics of spiritual literature and not new fangled words imported from an alien culture. To paraphrase Sri Aurobindo's observations on Western psychology, the secret of the beauty of a lotus flower cannot be unravelled by analysing the composition of the mud in which it grows but it can only be done by looking at the ideal of a lotus existing in some heavenly sphere above.

The last citadel and the long fight: Kerala is the last communist citadel and the LDF would fight with all collective strength of the Government machinery, police force and the numerical strength of its well-knit party cadre against any consolidation of the forces of Hindu dharma. They will try to buy over the Christian and Muslim vote banks and also use nefarious tactics of widening caste divide to split the consolidation of Hindu votes.

For the Hindus of Kerala, the battle is a long drawn out one. They will be isolated, maligned by the media and curbed by police power. What the Hindus of Kerala need is belief, the perennial nature of *Sanatana Dharma* that has survived greater onslaughts and invasions. But Hindus need to fight without forsaking the spirit of tolerance and compassion fostered by their faith, without becoming cowards in the bargain.

But in the political battle field,

Governments of the day will only acknowledge the strength of the vote bank. In the neo-Darwinian political scene of India, it is the survival of the vote bank. And it is here that divided Hindus will have to think wisely, decisively and cast their votes. Hindu religion never did stoop to fascism. It fostered civilisational values and strengthened nationhood. The writing on the wall is clearer now for the Hindus of Kerala than ever before.

# Scorching heat is melting the Himalayas

The ICIMOD's first ever assessment of climate change impacts on the Hindu Kush-Himalayan region must ring alarm bells.

Blanket approaches will not work. All host countries need to step up efforts and work in tandem

ebruary 4, 2019, was a significant day for the Himalayas as on this very day, the Kathmandu-based International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD) released the much-awaited first ever assessment report on the impact of climate change on the Hindu Kush-Himalayan (HKH) region.

The region — spread over 3,500 square kilometres across eight countries, including India, Nepal and China — is also known as the Water Tower of Asia due to its reserve of frozen water. The region is considered to be the core area of the Himalayas, which by themselves, are not the only youngest mountain range but are also con-

ceptually the Third Pole.

But thanks to rapid climate change, the Himalayas hog the headlines and mostly for all the wrong reasons. The ICMOD's assessment report is an effort by the inter-governmental body, involving a massive scientific exercise, comprising over 300 researchers and spanning over four years.

The report said that the HKH region is warming faster than the global average. And it would continue to do so during this century. This assessment is very concerning as the HKH region is an incredibly important asset for Asia and the world. It is a key source of water, energy, carbon stocks as well as rich biodiversity. For example, the rivers starting from HKH are home to about two billion people with the potential to generate 500 gigawatts of hydropower.

The region is, however, under threat from climate change in addition to a host of other changes, including ecosystem degradation, outmigration and air pollution.

Usually, mountains warm up faster than global averages. Even if we limit global warming to 1.5 degree Celsius, mountain temperatures would rise above two degree Celsius and if current trends continue, temperatures could go up by four to six degrees Celsius.

This holds dire consequences not only for our glaciers but also for food, energy, ecosystems and for the people, who rely on them in terms of ecosystem change, changing water flow patterns and increased hazards of disasters.

In a 1.5 degree Celsius world, about one-third of our glaciers will disappear by 2100 and under the current emission scenario, we will lose two-third of our glacier volumes. Many major cities in and near the HKH region have annual average PM2.5 concentrations of almost 10 times higher than the guidelines made by the World Health Organisation.

In addition to negative health impacts, this also adds to melting of our glaciers. Already, 70 to 80 per

cent of the habitat in biodiversity hotspots has been lost over the last 500 years and one-fourth of the endemic species could be lost by 2100.

Even now, overall condition in the HKH region is not good as poverty incidence is one-third as compared to the national average that's one-fourth.

Besides, over 30 per cent of the HKH population suffers from food insecurity and 50 per cent are faced with some form of malnutrition. Moreover, about 80 per cent of the rural population living in HKH countries lack access to clean energy for cooking. Added to this, there remains persistent gender and social imbalance in developmental activities.

Given these circumstances, it is crucial to bring global attention to the Himalayas. The ICMOD, with its 350 researchers, practitioners and policy-makers, has put minds together to bring out this scientific assessment so that the message is spread without any confusion.

The Himalayas are the last citadel of nature and climate change is breaching it. There is an urgent need for the HKH countries to step up efforts to lower greenhouse gas emissions so that runaway temperatures can be controlled.

In order to get there, it is important that they rein in air and water pollution and promote sustainable energy. This will help contain biodiversity loss and assist some of the most poor and vulnerable people to adapt to the environment. Inter-governmental cooperation has to be the foundation for this effort and the ICMOD's report can make for a good start.

Yet another method is to draw the countries into a meaningful dialogue so that the importance of health of the HKH region in particular and the Himalayan region in general is emphasised. This will help politicians, Government officials, media, business and other influential people work together, in tandem with the goals of preserving the environment.

Countries in the HKH region can take inspiration from the Arctic Council where countries have united to share information, to jointly develop solutions and to speak with a common voice to the global communities about the impacts of climate change and other concerns.

The world will not realise as it will not stand to lose if the HKH region is climatically compromised but HKH countries will surely feel the adverse impacts of climate change on the region, and India being part of the same, must take the lead and sensitse the countries of the impending environmental problems of the region and do the needful.

needful.

The uniqueness of the HKH region is its topography and ecology. They have to be preserved. Ditto for its traditional culture and communities. However, this can be possible only by keeping climate

change at bay at any cost.

Analysts said investor sentiment was bullish ahead of the Reserve Bank of India's monetary policy meeting outcome, scheduled for Thursday.

The RBI's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) began its three-day meet Tuesday to decide on key rates amid expectations that it may change its policy stance to 'neutral' from 'calibrated tightening' on low inflation footprint, even as a rate cut was ruled out by

Only two of the 30 Sensex stocks ended in the red --IndusInd Bank and Axis Bank, which slipped up to 0.54 per

Bajaj Finance, Tata Steel, ONGĆ, Bajaj Auto, ICICI Bank, NTPĆ, Coal India, M&M and RIL led the winners pack, spurting up to 4.34 per

## Sebi, stock exchanges step up surveillance

Capital markets watchdog Sebi and stock exchanges have stepped up their live surveillance of intra-day trading in select stocks in the wake of increased volatility seen in these scrips; and any manipulator would face strict regulatory action.

Sources said the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has asked the exchanges to beef up their vigil for any possible manipulation in stocks that are witnessing huge volatility and to report any irregularity urgently to the regulator for further action.

These surveillance measures include identification of unusual concentration of positions intraday, stepping up of the already existing order-level surveillance in addition to the trade-level surveillance, a source familiar with the regulatory move said. Besides, Sebi will also look at intra-day trading in these stocks through its own surveillance mechanism and take necessary action wherever required.

The regulator has its own stateof-the-art integrated surveillance mechanism in addition to the surveillance systems of the stock exchanges.

Following a directive from Sebi, top exchanges BSE and NSE, on Tuesday night, also asked their respective trading members to enhance their own monitoring of intra-day trading activities of their clients, and proactively report any adverse observation immediately to the bourses.

The stepped-up vigil by the regulator and the exchanges follows huge volatility seen in some stocks amid adverse news flow regarding their promoters and top management, and other issues. The exchanges have already sought explanations from these companies about volatility as well as the media reports.

In separate but similar circulars, the BSE and the NSE said they have stepped up their surveillance in view of the recent volatility in the market, and the trading members also have a responsibility of monitoring the trading activity of their

"Accordingly, trading members are advised to step-up monitoring of the trading activity of their clients including intra-day activity and proactively report to the exchange observations/findings, if any," the circular said.

A source said the Sebi's directive to the exchanges followed a significant stock-level volatility seen in the market and is aimed at keeping a watch on possible manipulation of prices of these stocks.

There are already robust surveillance systems in place, and these new measures are in addition to the existing vigil mechanism.

There has been an overflow of news regarding various scrips which has contributed to the volatility and the regulator wants to ensure that these situations should not be misused to manipulate the market.

"Such additional surveillance measures are taken by Sebi and exchanges whenever the market is volatile and it also serves as a caution to manipulators," the source

New Delhi: US retail major Walmart, which invested USD 16 billion in Flipkart, Wednesday said it is committed to the Indian market and is optimistic despite recent changes in the FDI policy for e-commerce firms in the country. The Bentonville-based retailing major's statement came after a recent report by global consultancy firm Morgan Stanley, which had hinted that Walmart may quit Flipkart as the new foreign direct investment (FDI) policy came into effect, which would lower its profitability in the long run. Morgan Stanley, in a report titled 'Assessing Flipkart Risk to Walmart EPS' dated February 4, claimed that "an exit is likely, not completely out of the question, with the Indian e-commerce market becoming more complicated". "Walmart's and Flipkart's commitment to India is deep and long term. Despite the recent changes in regulations, we remain optimistic about the country," said Dirk Van den Berghe, Executive Vice President and Regional CEO Walmart Asia and Canada. He added: "We will continue to focus on serving customers, creating sustained economic growth and bringing sustainable benefits to the country, including employment generation, supporting small businesses and farmers, and growing Indian exports to Walmart's global markets." Tightening norms for e-commerce firms having foreign investment, the government, from February 1, barred online marketplaces like Flipkart and Amazon from selling products of companies where they hold stakes and banned exclusive marketing arrangements that could influence product price. The revised policy on FDI in online retail, issued by the commerce and industry ministry, also said that these firms have to offer equal services or facilities to all its vendors without discrimination. Last year on August 18, Walmart had completed acquisition of 77 per cent stake in Flipkart for about USD 16 billion (Rs 1.05 lakh crore), a deal which gave the US retailer access to the Indian e-commerce market.

# Reject politics of revenge

Adefiant President Donald Trump Wednesday vowed to build a controversial wall along the US-Mexico border to stop illegal immigration and sought an end to the "politics of revenge", as he appealed to the divided Congress to bridge dif-ferences to avert another costly government shutdown.

President Trump in his second State of the Union address demanded an end to "partisan investigations" into his presidency, touted economic gains during his first two years in office as well as legislative wins on issues like criminal justice reform. In his 82-minute address, the 72-year-old Republican president warned that deepening partisan tensions undermine America's progress.

The annual State of the Union (SOTU) address is the keynote prime-time speech by the president to the Congress in which he sets out his legislative agenda and national priorities for the next year and highlights his achievements to the American people.

Trump's calls for reconciliation were met with mostly stone-faced silence from Democrats, who bitterly oppose his demand for USD 5.7 billion for the border wall, his divisive political agenda and accuse him of hastening the decline in

cross-party cooperation.

The president had a record 35-day standoff with the Democrats led by House Speaker Nancy Pelosi over his proposed wall along the US-Mexico border, which shut down the federal government and postponed the address which was earlier scheduled on January 29. The government shutdown cost the economy a whopping USD 11 billion, including a permanent USD 3 billion loss, the non-partisan Congressional Budget Office said last month. "In the past, most of the people in this room voted for a wall — but the prop-er wall never got built." "I'll get it built," Trump vowed. The "smart, strategic, see-through steel barrier", he said, will bring down the illegal crossings from Mexico.Trump presented him-self as a leader who can work across party lines. "We must

reject the politics of revenge, resistance and retribution and embrace the boundless potential of cooperation, compromise and the common good," he said, earning a chant of 'USA, USA' from his supporters but a disapproving stare from Speaker

"Together, we can break decades of political stalemate. We can bridge old divisions, heal old wounds, build new coalitions, forge new solutions and unlock the extraordinary promise of America's future." Trump also hit out at the "ridiculous partisan investigations" into his presidency, a reference to Special Counsel Robert Mueller's probe of Russian interference into the

2016 election which he won. Trump has long branded the special counsel's probe a "witch hunt". "We must be united at home to defeat our adversaries abroad," he said. "If there is going to be peace and legislation, there cannot be war and investigation. It just doesn't work that way!"

"An economic miracle is taking place in the United States and the only thing that can stop it are foolish wars, politics or ridiculous partisan investigations," Trump said, as Pelosi visibly scoffed behind him. "If there is going to be peace and legislation, there cannot be war and investigation. It just doesn't work that way!

Trump said that illegal immigration was an urgent national crisis and he vowed to build the border wall with Mexico. While the president wants USD 5.7 billion for the wall, the Democrats have offered funding for other border security measures.

Trump agreed to open the overnment until February 15 while lawmakers negotiate a border security funding package, but has threatened to shutter the government again or declare an emergency to secure wall funding if the deal is not to

"Simply put, walls work and walls save lives. So let's work together, compromise and reach deal that will truly make America safe," he said. Trump also declared that the US "will never become a socialist country". Though Trump spent much of his address to Congress urging lawmakers to overcome partisan gridlock, he also devot-

ed some time to foreign policy. He celebrated the defeat of the Islamic State, adding it was time to bring US troops home from conflict zones in the Middle East. "Great nations do not fight endless wars," he said that the time had now come for a political solution to the Afghanistan problem.

Trump described Iran as a "radical regime" and "the world's leading sponsor of state terror," adding: "They do bad, bad things." Trump vowed to right "calamitous" trade policies and sought to expand his power to impose tariffs which he said would empower him to respond faster during trade wars.

Trump told Congress that

Washington's aggressive trade negotiations with China would mean an end to its alleged "theft" of US jobs and wealth. He also asked Congress to pass the United States Reciprocal Trade Act.

The United States Reciprocal Trade Act, if signed into law, could have consequences on bilateral trade with countries like India. The proposed legislation would expand the White House's latitude to impose tariffs if other countries' tariffs or non-tariff barrier exceed US ones. Trump also reiterated the US opposition to embattled Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro.

Last month, Trump recognised opposition figure Juan Guaido as the legitimate leader of Venezuela amid the country's economic turmoil and political strife that has sparked a massive

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Trump-Kim summit on Feb 27-28 in Vietnam

Washington (PTI): US President Donald Trump will hold a second summit with North Korean leader Kim Jong-un in Vietnam on February 27 and 28 to jump-start a diplomatic effort to dismantle the reclusive nation's nuclear and missile programmes. The announcement about the meeting came during Trump's second State of the Union address. Kim and Trump met in Singapore last year, marking the first bilateral meeting between leaders of the two countries. While North Korea since then has refrained from overtly provocative actions like testing nuclear warheads or ballistic missiles, it has yet to agree to actually give up any piece of its atomic arsenal.

Addressing Congress, Trump said progress has been made in his administration's efforts to achieve peace on the Korean peninsula. "We con-tinue our historic push for peace on the Korean Peninsula. Our hostages have come home, nuclear testing has stopped and there has not been a missile launch in more than 15 months," Trump said during the address that lasted for more than 80 minutes.

"Much work remains to be "Much work remains to be done, but my relationship with Kim Jong-un is a good one," Trump said. "Chairman Kim and I will meet again on February 27 and 28 in Vietnam," he said. Trump, however, also gave an ominous warning about the risks of heightened tensions with

Pyongyang. "If I had not been elected President of the United States, we would right now, in my opinion, be in a major war with North Korea," Trump said. It is not clear in which city the summit will take place. Hanoi, the nation's capital, and Da Nang, a coastal resort town, have both been floated as possibilities.

## Taliban sit for 2<sup>nd</sup> day with Afghan leaders in Moscow

The Taliban entered a second day of unprecedented talks Wednesday with powerful Afghan politicians in Moscow, sidestepping the Kabul government as it pursues a leading stake in the war-torn country. The rare war-torn country. The rate public appearance that kicked off a day before saw Taliban officials spell out their vision for Afghanistan in front of rolling cameras and a host of political heavyweights, including former president Hamid

The insurgents went around President Ashraf Ghani and sat down with his chief rivals for an extraordinary meeting that saw Karzai and other sworn enemies of the Taliban praying with the militants. No government official was invited, despite Ghani's offers to talk peace, underscoring the Taliban's hostility toward the increasingly marginalised Kabul administration. The Moscow meet comes a week after the Taliban held separate talks toward ending 17 years of fighting with American negotiators in Doha, where Ghani was again not invited to the

President Donald Trump on Tuesday described those talks as "constructive" and voiced cautious hope for a negotiated end to America's longest war. The Taliban claimed Wednesday that the United States agreed in Doha to withdraw half its ground troops by the end of April and the process had begun.

"The Americans agreed to withdraw half of their troops immediately. The withdrawal will start from February 1 and continue until end of April," Abdul Salam Hanefi, deputy head of the Taliban's political office in Doha, told reporters in Moscow. But US negotiator Zalmay

Khalilzad has repeatedly stressed that "nothing is agreed until everything is agreed. 'Everything' must include an intra-Afghan dialogue and comprehensive ceasefire". The US has issued

The Taliban routinely exaggerates its attacks and details of other engagements, and NATO and Afghan officials deny the claims. A top US general also said that Kabul must be involved in talks if a push for a peace deal is to be successful.

"Ultimately, we need to get to a Taliban-Afghanistan discussion," General Joseph Votel, the head of US Central Command, told US lawmakers. "Only they will be able to resolve the key issues involved in the dispute." Ghani spoke with US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo late Tuesday, who had "underscored the central importance of ensuring the centrality of the Afghan government in the peace process", the president

But Ghani has vented frustration at being relegated to the wings as his political enemies shared prayers and meals with the Taliban while discussing the future of his country. "The Moscow meeting is nothing more than a fantasy. No one can decide without the consent of the Afghan people," Ghani told Afghan broadcaster TOLOnews.

"Those who have gathered in Moscow have no executive authority. They can say what they want, but who are they representing?" The Moscow conference is the Taliban's most significant engagement with Afghan leaders in recent memory — and unique for the militants who banned television when they ruled Afghanistan between 1996 and 2001.

Their leadership is rarely seen in public and scenes of Taliban officials clad in black turbans outlining their manifesto for live television is virtually unheard of. Before the Afghan envoys — including female delegates — the Taliban promised to loosen some restrictions on women and not seek a monopoly on power. ### Canadian crypto exchange may have lost \$145 mn after its CEO died in India

Toronto/New York (PTI): One of Canada's largest cryptocurrency exchanges has been granted bankruptcy protection after its 30-year old founder died unexpectedly in India, taking with him passwords of tens of thousands of customers who are unable to access USD 145 million in funds.

Ouadriga said it was unable to gain access to Canadian dollar 190 million (USD 145 million) of bitcoin and other digital assets after Gerald Cotten, its CEO and co-founder, died in December. He died of complications arising from Crohn's Disease, an inflammatory bowel ailment, while volunteering at an orphanage in India.

Many of the digital currencies held by Quadriga are stored offline in accounts known as "cold wallets," a way of protecting them from hackers. Cotten is the only person with access to the wallets, according to the company. Cotten's sudden death has plunged Quadriga into crisis and left it struggling to figure out how to refund more than 100,000 of its users, CNN report-

On Tuesday, the Vancouverbased company said it was granted creditor protection in the Nova Scotia Supreme Court in British Columbia as it tries to sort out its financial mess. Cotten's widow, Jennifer Robertson, described people posting inaccurate speculation on social media about "whether he is really dead." For the past weeks, we have worked extensively to address our liquidity issues, which include attempting to locate and secure our very significant cryptocurrency reserves held in cold wallets," Quadriga said in a statement. "Unfortunately, these efforts have

not been successful." Robertson said that the laptop that Cotten used to run the currency exchange is encrypted, according to a copy of her affidavit posted online by cryptocurrency news site CoinDesk.

"I do not know the password or recovery key," she said.

## Study: Our 'oohs' and 'aahs' convey 24 types of emotion

The spontaneous sounds that we make to express everything from elation to embarrassment, such as 'woohoo' and 'oops', convey at least 24 kinds of emotion, according to a study on people from four countries, including India. Scientists at the University of California (UC), Berkeley in the US conducted a statistical analysis of listener responses to more than 2,000 nonverbal exclamations known as "vocal bursts" and found they convey a lot more about what we are feeling than previously thought. Previous studies of vocal bursts set the number of recognisable emotions closer to 13. ] The results, published in the American Psychologist journal, are demonstrated in vivid sound and colour on the first-ever interactive audio map of nonverbal vocal communication developed by researchers.

This study is the most extensive demonstration of our rich emotional vocal repertoire, involving brief signals of upwards of two dozen emotions as intriguing as awe, adoration, interest, sympathy and embar-rassment," said Dacher Keltner, a professor at UC Berkeley.


For millions of years, humans have used wordless vocalisations to communicate feelings that can be decoded in a matter of seconds, researchers said. "Our findings show that the voice is a much more powerful tool for expressing emotion than previously assumed," said Alan Cowen, a PhD student at UC



In the audio map, a user can slide one's cursor across the emotional topography and hover over fear (scream), then surprise (gasp), then awe (woah), realisation (ohhh), interest (ah?) and finally confusion (huh?). Among other applications, the map can be used to help teach voice-controlled digital assistants and other robotic devices to better recognise human emotions based on the sounds we make, he said. Though limited to US responses, the study suggests humans are so keenly attuned to nonverbal signals — such as the bonding "coos" between parents and infants — that we can pick up on the subtle differences between surprise and alarm, or an amused laugh versus an

Researchers recorded more than 2,000 vocal bursts from 56 male and female professional actors and non-actors from the US, India, Kenya and Singapore by asking them to respond to emotionally evocative scenarios. More than 1,000 adults recruited via Amazon's Mechanical Turk online marketplace listened to the vocal bursts and evaluated them based on the

### Macedonia signs NATO accession accord

Brussels (AFP): Macedonia signed accession papers with NATO on Wednesday, a key step on the way to joining the alliance after resolving a longrunning name row with Greece. The Macedonian Foreign Minister Nikola Dimitrov and representatives of all current NATO members signed the protocol at alliance headquarters

NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg said it was a "historic day" which will lead to Macedonia becoming the 30th alliance member once the deal has been ratified by all the other capitals. "All #NATO Allies have signed the Accession Protocol ... which will bring more security & prosperity to the whole region. I look forward to the day when 30 flags will fly outside NATO HQ," Stoltenberg tweeted.

The agreement last month with Greece to change the name of the former Yugoslav republic to the Republic of North Macedonia ended one of the world's longest diplomatic disputes and paved the way for Skopje to join NATO and the European Union.

Macedonian Prime Minister Zoran Zaev said it was a "great, historic day for all our citizens". 'Today the largest security alliance in the world, NATO, has welcomed us," he wrote on Facebook and Twitter.

# Pak SC clips wings of armed forces, ISI

### ... says stay away from politics, act within law

PTI ISLAMABAD

In a rare rebuke to Pakistan's powerful military, the top court on Wednesday prohibited them from engaging in political activities and directed spy agencies like the ISI to operate within the law.Delivering a landmark ver-dict on the 2017 Faizabad sitin by the hardline Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) and other smaller groups, a twomember Supreme Court bench also ordered the government to act against those propagating "hatred, extremism and ter-

"We direct the federal and provincial governments to monitor those advocating hate, extremism and terrorism and prosecute the perpetrators in accordance with the law," the bench comprising Justice Qazi Faez Isa and Justice Mushir Alam ruled.

The court directed all government agencies and departments, including those run by the army like spy agency Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) to operate within the limits defined by the law.

The bench ordered that members of the Armed Forces were prohibited from engaging in any kind of political activity, which includes supporting a party, faction or individual. "The government of

Pakistan through the Ministry of Defence and the respective Chiefs of the Army, the Navy and the Air Force are directed to initiate action against the personnel under their com-



mand who are found to have violated their oath," the court

Several experts were of the view that Prime Minister Imran Khan was supported by the country's powerful army in the last year's general election.

Pakistan's powerful military has ruled the country through various coups for nearly half of the country's history since independence in 1947. The military plays an important role in the country's decision making. The apex court also outlawed religious edicts called fatwas that aimed to harm others.

"A person issuing an edict or fatwa, which harms anoth-er or puts another in harm's way, must be criminally prosecuted under the Pakistan Penal Code, the Anti-Terrorism Act, 1997 and/or the Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act, 2016," the court ruled. The court upheld that subject to reasonable restrictions imposed by law, citizens have the right to form and to

be members of political parties. They can also assemble for peaceful protest.

It said the right to assemble and protest is circumscribed only to the extent that it infringes on the fundamental rights of others, including their right to free movement and to hold and enjoy proper-ty. The court ordered that those protesters who obstruct people's right to use roads and damage or destroy property must be proceeded against in accordance with the law and held accountable.

It initiated suo motu proceedings on November 21, 2017 after TLP blocked a main highway leading to Islamabad. During the 20-day long protest in 2017, daily life in Islamabad was disrupted when protesters belonging to the TLP, Tehreeki-Labbaik Ya Rasool Allah, the Tehreek-i-Khatm-i-Nabuwwat and the Pakistan Sunni Tehreek occupied the Faizabad Interchange which connects Rawalpindi and Islamabad, the busiest roads in the twin cities.

## Gilani stopped from leaving country

 $F^{\rm ormer\ Pakistan\ prime\ minister\ Yousuf\ Raza\ Gilani,}$ who is facing corruption charges, was stopped from leaving the country by immigration officials at the Lahore airport after his name popped up in the no-fly list.

According to theFederal Investigation Agency, 66-year-old Gilani reached the Allama Iqbal International Airport here Tuesday night to board a flight for South Korea via Bangkok to attend a conference. However, his name was on the no-fly list. "At the immigration counter, Mr Gilani was

on the black list therefore he could not leave the country," the FIA said, adding that it was following orders from the interior ministry. Reacting strongly, the senior Pakistan Peoples Party leader said he always appeared in courts in the different cases against him.

'There was no point in placing my name on (the) no-fly list. I was not fleeing the

"We look to regional actors such as Pakistan to cease behaviour undermining regional stability and play constructive role in achieving peace in Afghanistan as well as the whole of South Asia," General Votel told members of the Senate Armed Services Committee. In his testimony,



Pakistan has taken positive steps to assist Special US Representative of Afghanistan Zalmay Khalilzad in support of Afghanistan reconciliation by facilitating talks with the Taliban. But Pakistan "has avoided taking any concrete or irreversible steps such as arresting or expelling Taliban leaders who do not cooperate with reconciliation efforts," he said. Since being appointed in September last, Khalilzad has

### Egypt Oppn rejects move to extend el-Sissi's rule

Cairo (AP): Egyptian opposition parties have formed a coalition against proposed changes to the constitution that would allow President Abdel-Fattah el-Sissi to stay in office well beyond the end of his current term in 2022, two opposition leaders said on Wednesday. Egypt's parliament has given its preliminary approval to the changes, after two-thirds endorsed the proposed amendments on Tuesday.

The 596-seat assembly which is packed with el-Sissi supporters — will take a final vote on February 17, but the amendments would also need to be put to a national referendum. Abdel-Aziz el-Husseini, a senior leader in the Karama, or Dignity party, said that 11 parties met the previous day and declared their opposition to the proposed changes.

The group established a "union for the defence of the constitution" that includes secular and left-leaning parties and law-makers, he added. Khaled Dawood, another opposition leader and former head of the liberal Dostour, or Constitution party, questioned the legitimacy of the process to amend the 2014 charter, citing a constitutional clause that bars extending the two-term limit.

"We will challenge the proposed amendment before the country's Supreme Constitutional court," he said. Amending the constitution was widely expected. Pro-government lawmakers and media figures have argued for years that the constitution is crippling the president's efforts to advance the country, including overhauling its economy and defeating Islamic militants. El-Sissi himself said in 2015 that "the constitution was drafted with good intentions." A draft of the proposed amendments shows concerted efforts by the pro-government "Supporting Egypt" coalition to consolidate el-Sissi's

The 64-year-old leader could be allowed to run for a third and fourth six-year term, potentially extending his rule to 2034. Talaat Khalil, a lawmaker attending Monday's meeting, decried the proposed changes, especially a broad clause stating the military's duty is to protect "the constitution and democracy and the fundamental makeup of the country and its civil nature."

He told a press conference on Monday that this could allow the armed forces to support one politician at the cost of another. "And this is a great danger," he

Sharif, 69, is serving a sevenyear jail term over graft charges. Sharif was shifted to the Services Hospital from Kot Lakhpat jail Lahore on Saturday on the recommendations of the third special medboard at the Services Hospital said Sharif's treatment is possible in any specialised cardiac health facility in Pakistan.

'We examined Nawaz Sharif and carried out his tests related to blood count, hormones, bio-chemistry, radiology, heart, kidneys, brain and eyes. He also underwent CT scan, ultrasound and Colour Doppler tests at the Services Hospital Lahore," Professor Mahmood Ayaz, the head of the medical board at the

Services Hospital, said. "After examining all results, the medical board has reached a unanimous deci-



sion that Sharif needs some For the purpose he should be shifted to a cardiac institute," he said. Sharif had heart issues because of his previous history of some diseases, including high blood pressure, diabetes and kidney problem, he added.

"According to the findings of the board, Nawaz Sharif is facing some problems in blood supply of heart veins that must be addressed by cardiac specialists. We had engaged some cardiac specialists from the Punjab Institute of Cardiology who examined the patient and his test reports and suggested little change in Mr Sharif's medicines," Ayaz said.

He said the board has recommended to the Punjab gov-ernment that Sharif should be thoroughly examined by cardiologists for his cardiac complications. A Punjab govern-ment official told PTI that Sharif will be shifted to the Puniab Institute of Cardiology (PIĆ) Lahore for treatment of his cardiac complications. "A new board will be constituted at the PIC and any decision to shift him back to hospital will be taken on its recommendations," the official said.

## Made-to-order human kidneys one step closer

Researchers say they have successfully grown functional kidneys inside rats using just a few donor stem cells, an advance with significant implications for human organ transplantation. For patients with end-stage renal disease, a kidney transplant is the only hope for regaining quality of life, according to the study pub-lished in the journal Nature Communications. Yet many of these patients will never undergo transplant surgery due to a chronic shortage of donor kidneys, said researchers from the National Institute for Physiological Sciences in Japan.

With 95,000 patients on the waiting list for a donor kidney in the US alone, demand far outstrips supply, they said.However, researchers have been working on ways to grow healthy organs outside the human body. One such method, called blastocyst complementation, has already produced promising results.

Researchers take blastocysts, the clusters of cells formed several days after egg fertilisation, from mutant animals missing specific organs



and inject them with stem cells from a normal donor, not necessarily of the same species. The stem cells then differentiate to form the entire missing organ in the resulting animal.

The new organ retains the characteristics of the original stem cell donor, and can thus potentially be used in trans-plantation therapy. "We previ-ously used blastocyst complementation to generate rat pancreas in a pancreatic mutant mice," said Teppei Goto, the

lead author of the study.
"We therefore decided to investigate whether the method could be used to generate functional kidneys, which would have much greater application in regenerative medicine owing to the high donor demand," Goto said. Initial attempts by the researchers to grow rat kidneys in mice proved unsuccessful, as rat stem cells did not readily differentiate into the two main types of cells needed for kidney formation.

However, when the reverse

scenario was attempted, mouse

stem cells efficiently differen-

tiated inside rat blastocysts,

forming the basic structures of

a kidney. After being implant-

ed into pseudo-pregnant rats, the complemented blastocysts matured into normal fetuses, researchers said. More than two thirds of the resulting rat neonates contained a pair of kidneys derived from the mouse stem cells. Further screening showed that all of the kidneys were structurally intact, and at least half could potentially produce

urine. "Our findings confirm that interspecific blastocyst complementation is a viable method for kidney generation," said study corresponding author Masumi Hirabayashi.

"In the future, this approach could be used to generate human stem cellderived organs in livestock, potentially extending the lifespan and improving the quality of life of millions of people worldwide," said Hirabayashi.



DOESN'T REST

id you know that a woman can't be arrested after six in the evening and if she is being taken into the police custody after that, there has to be a woman guard around her all the time till she's there. Well, actress Swara Bhasker came to know the fact recently.

There are laws that lay down the substantive rights of the masses, pertaining to the benefits of the people. However, due to lack of proper awareness, such provisions hardly yield any justice, highlights Swara as she speaks about the forthcoming drama on Colors, Courtroom.

She says, "There are numerous laws which people don't know about but should be aware of. The show will make these legal procedures and important laws accessible to people in an interesting way." It is because none will ever specifically open a book to read about laws, else they would have been lawyers.

She says that there's a fear that grips people when they first hear of court and legal procedures. "They always want to avoid them. They start thinking about the high court and repeated visits to the lower ones for case proceedings, feeling that the next 25 years of their lives might just get wasted doing this. Pendency is a great issue in our country. But that is also because common people hardly know the exact court procedures and the way law works in the country," says Swara. She highlights that it's interesting "how law is made for people's protection and that in turn puts them into trouble."

The actress says that when she got to know about the show, she found it very "interesting" even though she is not a part of it, she wanted to support it.
The Anarkali of Aarah actress believes

that it's important for our society to question the right and wrong of things. She says, "In our country most people act without thinking. We are just reacting to things. Such shows are important for them to know, think, question and act

accordingly." There have been shows like Crime Patrol, Savdhaan India, that have showed numerous real-life cases of crime against humanity and alerted the society. Swara believes that such shows are capable of analysing fear as well as tracing the criminal mindset.

She says, "It depends on the way a particular crime is portrayed. No subject in itself is good or bad." She believes that if you choose to "fetishise" a crime or "sensationalise" it and show it in a "dhinchak way by using sensational headlines around it. it will only make it seem justified to those who have a pervert mindset. We don't need to look at fiction for sensationalising any crime as our TV soaps and them report on such heinous events in an irresponsible manner."

Giving an example, she talks about the film *Talvar*, a repertory on Arushi-Hemraj murder case of 2008. She exclaims, "There's a difference in the way the film shows the case as compared to some TV shows that have tried to show the same case in a sensational manner. No subject in itself is good or bad. It's important for people who create fiction to show a crime in a sensitive manner that makes people also delve deeper into it seriously and as something that is unjustified."

Adding on to that, she says that showing a rape or molestation of a woman that objectifies their body and fetishises the violence in a perverse manner "can only make the crime appear pleasurable and justified to some people. It's all a game of percep-

Even though the actress has been trolled by multiple accounts, she continues to be very active on social media when it comes to raising concerns over crimes against women. She says that she doesn't believe in making social media as a courtroom of justice just like it increasingly is becom-

"Social media has become a court in itself and I am very much against this idea. You much against this idea. You can't replace the judiciary with mob lynchings, virtual trails or any kind of revolution on Twitter. It's for connecting and socialising and spreading views, not for making a jury out of it," says she.

Recalling the Mumbai attacks of 26/11, she says that when Kasab had been caught, "there was an anger and josh among people to kill him by hanging him on the streets. Such a dangerous thing to do and ask for! There was mob violence all around. Indeed he was terrorist and had to be punished. But not in this way."

She goes on to add, "We have to be very careful when we talk about justice. We can't turn into inhuman carnivores or devils in order to get justice. Hence, there's a court and a room of people who have read about the Constitution and law to give justice to us. They know the way and are much qualified, trained and smarter than us common people to take law in their hands. Let it happen the rational way."

that she does, especially on social media. "I don't ever regret it. I don't feel the need to. When

you are under the public eye, you have to have a thick skin and be firm on whatever you say. People will always dig something out of it. This doesn't mean you stay quiet against the

wrong."
Talking about challenging patriarchy at home, she says that it will be done only when we start speaking up. It is some-thing that equally affects the boys as it does to the girls. Talking about her previous opening on sexual harassment at the workplace, she says that women don't know what is happening to them. "When I shared about the incident, I realised that just because the harasser never touched me, it doesn't mean that it wasn't harassment. I managed to save myself. I realised at that time it didn't feel like harassment to me because of a lack of awareness. To recognise, we need to break the

silence and start conversations." She says that women have been raising their voices since time immemorial but it's only now that our ears have risen to hear them out. "The Vishakha case is an example and it was in the late 1990s. We are fighting for the same thing even today – sexual harassment at workplace. It's been three decades since," says Swara.

Talking about the #MeToo movement, she says that we are looking at the movement in just one way — how many women have come and spoken against their harassers.

But she feels we shouldn't judge the campaign only on that basis. "We should look at it as a cathartic movement which is breaking a silence and teaching to recognise the wrong. It is also about accepting and recognising Swara, who was trolled that this happened to me years incessantly for her masturbation ago and today I have the courage Wedding, says that she doesn't through this, could realise that regret doing or saying anything a certain person wasn't just a stupid or insane man, rather he

# What's your kid browsing?

A survey reveals people's habits and behaviour towards internet safety. By TEAM VIVA

lives without the internet. It's not an era of gaining knowledge through spending hours in libraries and with books. It's a Google Search era. However, not many are aware of the impact it has on people and about creating a safer and better internet. On the Safer Internet Day, an online marketplace company released a survey about 2019 internet behaviour and impact. The survey with 26,000+

and impact. The survey with 26,000+ netizens revealed internet behaviour and attitude towards safety — both online and in general — with an aim to drive awareness and call for action to all users and play an active role towards creating a better and safer internet for all, especially the younger lot. The survey covers respondents between 18 to 55 years of age from Delhi-NCR, Mumbai, Bangalore, Ahmedabad, Chennai and Hyderabad. As per the survey, a majority of

netizens neglected cybersecurity practices in their personal lives. Around 57 per cent respondents showed negligence towards their safety both online and offline. Around 56 per cent of netizens freely shared their personal details like mobile number on their professional or official social media accounts. Over 14,543 users made their contact numbers visible online on accounts like LinkedIn, whereas only

11,648 users didn't share it. There were some personal revelations too. While 6,355 netizens said that they regularly monitor their children and what they do online,

reading the 'terms & conditions' or any other safety/legal guidelines while signing up to a website or using a product. There only 8,689 users who read the terms and conditions against 17,502 users who didn't.

The survey also revealed some regular habits like changing of pass-

words. While 54 per cent of the people said they had not changed the passwords to their social media accounts in the last six months to a year, 31 per cent admitted they cannot even recall how long had it been since they last changed their passwords.

A similar neglect towards safety measures was also observed with police verification of household staff. Around 75 per cent confirmed that they had not conducted a police verification or did not know if one had to be done. About only 25 per cent confirmed having observed this process for household staff. Respondents from Delhi were the highest among those who said they observe this process for household staff, followed by those from Mumbai.

However, contradictory to the overall neglect, there also existed a high degree of awareness with financial safety. Around 68 per

cent said that they had never shared their ÓTP or password for their bank account, social media accounts, laptop or phone with any-

It will be more about the battle of nerves, considering that lower-order batsmen from both the sides have shown that scoring runs is not impossible, if the application is correct.

Batting first, unheralded keeper-batsman Tim Seifert took the Indian bowling apart blasting 84 off 43 balls as New Zealand posted a commanding 219 for six.

With the crack opening pair of skipper Rohit Sharma (1) and Shikhar Dhawan (29) departing within the Powerplay overs, the chase became a difficult one and India was all out for 139 in 19.2 overs.

Mahendra Singh Dhoni (39 off 31 balls) did play his part but was always an impossible chase with wickets falling at regular intervals at the other end India had never lost a T20 International by 50 or more runs prior to this match. India's previous worst was a 49-run loss to Australia back in 2010.

New Zealand bowlers kept the pressure on Indian batsmen, especially the two spinners – left-arm orthodox Mitchell Santner (2/24 in 4 overs) and leg-spinner Ish Sodhi (2/26 in 3

Senior pacer Tim Southee (3/17 in 4 overs) had the best figures among the bowlers and the

Leg-spinner Amelia Kerr (2/28) clinched the crucial wickets of Mandhana and Indian captain Harmanpreet Kaur to wreck the visitors' chances. Offspinner Leigh Kasperek also picked up a couple of wickets.

"Obviously we didn't get the start we wanted but it was pretty good to come back and win. It's just about keeping calm," said Tahuhu, who was adjudged player of the match for her per-

Harmanpreet, on the other hand, blamed India's loss on a poor batting effort, especially in the last 10 overs.

"I think bowlers did really well as we expected. We didn't bat well in the last 10 overs. That is only area where we are always struggling," she pointed out. Veteran Mithali Raj, who

captains the Indian ODI side, was dropped from the match. "We are looking to give chance to young girls, that's the

only reason," said Harmanpreet when asked about Mithali's absence from the line-up and whether her experience would have come handy here.

Mandhana and Jemiamah Rodrigues (39 off 33 balls) combined for a 102-run secondwicket stand that should have been a solid foundation for the

rest of the line-up.

But India collapsed in the face of an inspired performance by Lahuhu.

From 101/1, the visiting team was down to 117/6 in a matter of five overs that turned the match on its head.

Harmanpreet (17 off 15 balls) played out a small cameo, including a massive six off Kerr, but couldn't steer the team home, failing to find any support at the other end.

Mandhana was her usual aggressive self and played another strokeful knock, studded with seven hits to the fence and three sixes.

Earlier, opening batswoman ophie Devine smashed a 48ball 62 in an enterprising innings to take New Zealand women to a challenging 159 for 4 from 20 overs after being put into bat.

Devine's aggressive innings was laced with six boundaries and two sixes. She and captain Amy Satterthwaite (33) shared a 69-run stand for the third wicket to steer New Zealand out of trouble after a stuttering start.

Spinners Radha Yadav and Poonam Yadav dimissed Suzie Bates (7) and Caitlin Gurrey (15) cheaply to reduce the home side to 47 for 2 at the end of the seventh over. But the Indians failed to make further dents with Devine and Satterthwaite denying them any success for 8.3 Devine and Satterthwaite fell

in the space of six deliveries off the bowling of Arundhati Reddy and Deepti Sharma in the 16th and 17th overs respectively but New Zealand still made á late flourish by scoring 38 runs from the final 3.3 overs.

"It was a tough game. We were outplayed in all three departments. We didn't start well and we knew that 200 was not going to be an easy chase," he said after the game.

"We have chased such (big) targets in the past and that is why we played with eight batsmen. But we didn't have (even) small partnerships and that made it tougher. New Zealand though played well, they had partnerships. We need to go to Auckland, have a look at the conditions and take it from there," he added.

Outplayed 1-4 by India in the ODI series, Black Caps skipper Kane Williamson was happy to finally see his team produce a "complete performance" in the first T20I.

"Fantastic performance all around, everyone rose and it was one of those complete performances that you search for. The top-order was superb and we built partnerships that helped us," Williamson said.

"But it has finished now, we move on in a day's time and we have another game. Hope we can keep the momentum through the series having set the tone."

Opening duo of Tim Seifert (84) and Colin Munro (34) lay the foundation for New Zealand's total before the bowlers returned to complete the job. "Seifert and Munro were outstanding. It really was

a good experience for the boys. Some of the short contributions were of great importance. Daryll bowled really well and played a good cameo down the order. We had the runs on the board, but the bowling and fielding too was of high standard," Williamson said.

Seifert, who was adjudged the 'Man of the Match' for his 43-ball 84, said he was happy to live up to the expectations after his selection in the team.

"It was a great way to start the series and the boys are really happy. It feels great to go up the order. I had a look at the first two overs and then took it from there and put pressure on the bowlers," he said.
