## Rahul refuses to budge on exit

Cong chief asks Ahmed Patel, KC Venugopal to look for his replacement

Adamant on his resignation from the post of the Congress president, Rahul Gandhi has conveyed to senior party leaders Ahmed Patel and KC Venugopal to look for his replacement as he has made up his mind not to continue as chief of the grand old party.

Patel is a close confidant of the Congress' first family and was one of the most powerful politicians during the 10 years of the UPA rule. After the disastrous performance of the party in the Lok Sabha polls, Rahul has cancelled all meetings and appointments and has declined to meet even elected MPs.

Taking responsibility for the drubbing at the hands of the BJP, Rahul on Saturday offered to resign as party president at a meeting of the Congress Working Committee (CWC), the highest decision-making body of the party, but it was "unanimously rejected".

"He has conveyed that the party will have to find a new chief as he won't change his mind. It is believed his mother Sonia and sister Priyanka, who were earlier advising Rahul to continue, too have backed his decision. The future course will be decided in some time now," said a top AICC leader.

While majority of the Congress leaders hoped that Rahul will "not abandon the post", sources close to him said he is determined not to take

back his decision.

The Congress has mostly been led by members of the Nehru-Gandhi family except for the period after former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi was assassinated in 1991. The party did not do well under Sitaram Kesri and then several leaders convinced Sonia Gandhi to take charge of the

party.

At the CWC meeting, Rahul had accused three senior leaders — Ashok Gehlot, Kamal Nath and P Chidambaram — of placing their sons above the party. Priyanka said the entire top brass of the party left Rahul alone to fight it out against Prime Minister Narendra

Modi.

In the midst of the disquiet, several State Congress chiefs, including Punjab's Sunil Jakhar, Jharkhand's Ajoy Kumar, and Assam's Ripun Bora, too offered to resign from their posts following the party's drubbing in the elections. The party won only 52 seats in the Lok Sabha polls, just six more

than its 2014 tally. The party could not open its account in 18 States and Union Territories.

As crisis beset the Opposition party, its chief spokesperson Randeep Surjewala on Monday urged everyone to respect the sanctity of the CWC meeting and asked the media not to fall into the trap of "conjectures, insinuations, gossip and rumour-mongering".

Surjewala said it is a democratic forum for exchange of ideas and taking corrective action. It was a "closed-door" meeting and any speculation about it was unwarranted and uncalled for. He was reacting to news reports about happenings at the May 25 meeting, the first of the CWC after the Congress's humiliating defeat in the parliamentary polls.

"The Congress party expects everyone, including the media, to respect the sanctity of a closed-door meeting of the CWC. Various conjectures, speculation, insinuations, assumptions, gossip and rumour-mongering in a section of the media is uncalled for and unwarranted."

"The CWC held a collective deliberation on the performance of the party, the challenges before it as also the way ahead, instead of casting aspersions on the role or conduct of any specific individual. The gist of the deliberations was made public in the CWC resolution of May 25, 2019," the Congress leader said in a statement.

## Our chemistry with voters beat experts' poll math: PM

BJP workers killed in Bengal for their ideology, says Modi

Chemistry has beaten arithmetic in the recent Parliamentary election, said Prime Minister designate Narendra Modi, who is going to assume the charge as the PM for second time on May 30.

"It was not for the first time when this political change was seen in Indian politics when the chemistry of social strength was clearly visible but shockingly, the political pundits were not ready to change their established perception," he said.

Modi was addressing party workers in thanksgiving function at Deen Dayal Updhyay Haskala Sankul (Trade Facilitation Centre) at Bada Lalpur here on Monday.

"We had made a hat-trick of victories performing remarkably well in 2014, 2017 and 2019 but, unfortunately, the political pundits were not ready to change their established perception of the last 70 years and sometimes they used

logical and illogical analysis to prove their point," Modi added.

Earlier, Modi offered prayer at Kashi Vishwanath temple, seeking the blessings of the Almighty again as he did five years ago before assuming the charge as PM.

Modi appealed to the party workers to overlook established negativity in politics and continue to adopt positivity. "Our success is the result of our perfect synergy between Government policies and organisational politics," he said, asking the party workers to continue with the same so that the people of the country can get optimum benefits of Government schemes.

"Work and workers create a wonder," said Modi, adding that "with our work we succeeded in winning the faith of the people. We have not done any favour to them but it was their rights."

Modi went on to highlight the violence let loose against party workers in several States, and said, "Undoubtedly, in achieving the same, our party workers faced crises. Several of our workers sacrificed their lives in Kerala, Kashmir, West Bengal and Tripura and our

workers are still being beaten up in West Bengal, but shockingly a section of the national media had seen a selective humanism behind such sacrifices of our party workers."

"We'd also faced political untouchability," he said, citing the example of Gujarat when a section of film industry had raised strong voices when his Government had invited a senior star (Amitabh Bachchan) for tourism promotion.

In his marathon address, Modi highlighted how for vote-bank politics the Opposition parties never showed courage to look into the pains of the common people.

Kyrgyzstan Prez, Mauritian PM to attend Modi's swearing-in

However, Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina would not be attending Modi's swearing-in this time too as she would be on a three-nation tour close to May 30. Liberation War Affairs Minister AKM Mozammel Haq will represent her at the ceremony.

## BSP spares Gehlot Govt, but trouble brews inside

MLAs meet with Raj Guv put off after Sonia hails Mayawati cadre

In a huge relief for the Congress in Rajasthan, six BSP MLAs cancelled their proposed meeting with Governor Kalyan Singh at the last minute and downplayed speculation about pulling out of the Gehlot Government.

However, the Congress faced trouble from within amid speculation of a Rajasthan Minister quitting in the wake of the party's electoral debacle. Two State Ministers came out in the open to demand a detailed assessment by senior leaders of the party.

Sources said the six BSP MLAs were scheduled to meet the Governor on Monday in the evening. However, later the Governor was informed that the meeting could not proceed due to illness of one of the MLAs, Deepchand.

The BSP has extended its support to the Congress in Rajasthan and Madhya

Pradesh, thus the news of its MLAs seeking appointment with the Governor sparked wild speculation.

BSP MLA Wajib Ali sought to downplay the significance of the MLAs' scheduled meeting with the Governor. "It was supposed to be a routine meeting," he said.

Sources, however, said the BSP MLAs changed their minds on the instructions from the party's Central leadership following the circulation of appreciation letter by UPA chairperson and senior most Congress leader Sonia Gandhi hailing the role of BSP workers along with

the SP cadre in the just concluded general elections.

Meanwhile, a review meeting scheduled in Delhi to evaluate reasons for party's drubbing in Rajasthan was postponed in the wake of unavailability of Congress president Rahul Gandhi.

Party sources said the meeting would be held on Tuesday at Sonia's residence in the presence of Ashok Gehlot, Deputy Chief Minister Sachin Pilot and Congress State in-charge Avinash Pandey. Senior party leader Ahmed Patel and Venugopal are likely to participate in the meet.

## Delhi orders fire audit of coaching centres after 22 die in Surat blaze

In the wake of deaths of 22 students at a coaching institute blaze in Surat on Friday, Delhi Home Minister Satyender Jain on Monday issued directions to the chief of Delhi Fire Services (DFS) to "take strict action as per the fire safety standards and guidelines to prevent recurrence of such accidents" in the national Capital.

The Director (Fire Services) has been asked to immediately inspect and shut and seal coaching centres operating in highrise buildings above the fourth floor. The Delhi Government further issued notice to all the civic authorities to enforce the 'Unified Building Bylaws' in coaching centres.

"In the first phase, all coaching centres operating in high-rise buildings (more than four floors excluding the still floor) shall be inspected by the Director (Fire Service)," the order read.

As per the law, kitchen/cooking and storage of inflammable material are not allowed on rooftops. Multi-storey buildings, hotels and commercial buildings will lose No Objection Certificate (NOC) for violation of norms.

## Holed-up in Balakot fear, terror camps hitch ISI ride to LoC

The Balakot air strikes notwithstanding, over three dozen terror camps along the Line of Control (LoC) in Pakistan Occupied Kashmir (POK) are getting active again. Post-Pulwama attack, these camps were shifted deep inside Pakistan fearing retaliation by India. However, after lying dormant for nearly three months, the ISI and the Pakistan Army are bringing these terrorists closer to the LoC to enable them to infiltrate to stoke violence in Jammu & Kashmir.

This alarming development comes even as Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) chief Masood Azhar was recently

proscribed as a global terrorist by the UN Security Council. Most of the terrorists now regrouping in the camps are from JeM and Lashkar-e-Tayyeba (LeT). The Indian Army has thus increased vigil to thwart any Border Action Team (BAT) action besides infiltration.

Mixed teams of terrorists and elite Special Services Group (SSG) commandos of the Pakistan Army comprise BAT which carries out cross border raids to ambush Indian Army patrols. As it is, the several teams of SSG commandos, along with the Pakistan Army troops, moved forward towards the LoC post Balakot air strikes by the IAF and remain deployed even now thereby

increasing the threat perception, officials in the security establishment said here on Monday.

Indicating that after the Balakot strikes, in which the JeM major camps were targeted and destroyed, notwithstanding, the State sponsored terrorism machinery of Pakistan is now active again with the terror camps along the LoC reorganising themselves, they said.

Most of the 40 odd camps along the vulnerable stretches of the long LoC are located not more than one to two kms from the border and stationed close to the Pakistan Army and Pakistan Rangers locations.

Following the Pulwama suicide attack on February 13



in which 40 Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel were killed, nearly all the terror camps were shut down as the Pakistan Army anticipated surgical strikes. In fact, many terrorists took refuge in the JeM camp in Balakot.

With the three dozen odd camps now regrouping, the Indian security establishment is bracing for renewed bids to sneak into Jammu & Kashmir in the following weeks with the Pakistan Army providing covering fire to the terrorists.

Due to prolonged winter this year and heavy snowfall, most of the ingress routes especially in North Kashmir remained blocked due to snow till about a few days back.

As snow is now melting,

the LoC is likely to see increased infiltration bids, officials said, adding the Indian Army has taken all necessary measures to prevent any misdeed by the Pakistani terrorists. In fact, during the winter months, troops were not withdrawn from the LoC, as in the past few years, as a precautionary measure, they said.

Moreover, taking note of the terror camps across LoC getting active, the Indian Army has increased patrols all along the LoC besides further strengthening its multi-tiered anti-infiltration grid. The main objective is to neutralise the infiltrators within a km or so near the LoC if they are successful in coming in, officials explained.

# Haryana CM reviews metro projects in State

Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal on Monday directed the officers to work actively to realise the commitment of the State Government for extension of metro connectivity in NCR especially in districts Gurugram, Faridabad, Sonapat, Jhajjar and Rohtak so as to ensure ease of traffic and providing better public transport system to people of the state.

The Chief Minister was presiding over review meeting of Delhi Metro Rail Projects in the state.

He said that the control of all metro rail projects in the state should be brought under Haryana Metro Rail Transport Corporation so that the state



would not have to rely on organizations such as Delhi Metro Rail Corporation and RITES.

The new metro rail projects which were reviewed in

the meeting included 4.86 km long metro corridor from Narela to Kundli which would be extended till Rajiv Gandhi Education City, about 30.38 km long metro corridor

between Gurugram and Faridabad, 17.10 km long metro corridor from City Park (Bahadurgarh) to Sampla, 23.10 km long metro corridor between Badsa

(AIIMS and National Cancer Institute) and Dwarka (via NPR). Similarly, 6.30 km long metro connectivity on SPR between Sector 56 and Vatika Chowk, Gurugram was also

reviewed.

During the meeting, it was informed that at present the biggest metro rail network of the country of 40 kms is available in Haryana and there is a proposal to extend it to 75 to 80 kms in the fourth phase of Delhi Metro Rail Corporation.

The Chief Minister directed the officers to explore possibilities to work on metro rail project in tricity, Chandigarh through Haryana Metro Rail Transport Corporation.

Among others present in the meeting included Public Works (Building and Roads), Rao Narbir Singh, Urban Local Bodies Minister Kavita Jain, MLAs namely Umesh Aggarwal and Tejpal Tanwar, Chief Secretary DS Dhese and senior officers.

## INBRIEF

### HARYANA INCREASES DA

Chandigarh: Haryana Government has enhanced rate of dearness allowance (DA) for State Government employees, pensioners and family pensioners from 9 per cent to 12 per cent with effect from January 1, 2019. The extra financial liability on state exchequer is estimated at Rs 17.70 crore approximately per month, Haryana Finance Minister, Capt. Abhimanyu said on Monday. He said that the current year extra financial liabilities for 14 months, from January 2019 to February 2020, would be Rs 247.80 crore. The State Government has also enhanced the DA by 6 per cent for State Government employees, who continue to draw their pay in the pre-revised pay scale or grade as per the 6th Pay Commission, from the existing rate of 148 per cent to 154 per cent of the basic pay, with effect from January 1, 2019, he said. This DA enhancement would have extra financial liability of Rs 63.55 lakh approximately per month. The additional financial liabilities in financial year 2019-20 for 14 months, from January 2018 to February 2020, would be about Rs. 889.70 lakh, he added.

### SUSHMA'S "FOOD FOR ALL" ENTERS SECOND PHASE

Chandigarh: "Food For All" initiative of Sushma Foundation, a non-profit organisation by Sushma Group after completing four successful months entered its second phase. The initiative started in January has so far fed 20,000 underprivileged people and is expanding rapidly. Starting from Sushma's society the initiative has now attracted many big names in the tricity including major food chains, bars, restaurants and NGOs. The motive behind the noble step taken by Sushma foundation is to prevent the wastage of food and donating to the less fortunate. From collecting leftover food in vans from Sushma Square, a group of different projects at Ghazipur road, Dhakoli in Zirakpur, the initiative grew swiftly to having the neighboring societies and big names including Tawa restaurant, Chawla's Chicken and Krishna Sweets and Dairy as their contributors.

### IDFC AMC OPENS NEW BRANCH OFFICE IN CHD

Chandigarh: IDFC Asset Management Company Limited (AMC), in line with its business expansion plan, opened a new branch office at SCO 2469-70, 1st Floor, Sector 22 - C here. ### EDU DEPT TO ORGANISE TRAINING

Chandigarh: Haryana Higher Education Department will impart mandatory training for Centralized Online Admission to all Principals, Nodal Officers of Online Admissions and Computer instructor (one other faculty member) of all colleges in the state. The training will be imparted from May 30 to June 6 at division level.

The Chief Minister evinced keen interest in the presentation made by the Corporation regarding their activities in the state and requested them to participate in the Corporate Social Responsibility activities in the state.

# GMDA approves metro rail connectivity

The Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority on Monday approved the Detailed Project Report (DPR) for metro rail connectivity from HUDA City Centre to Cyber City/Rapid Metro, Gurugram.

The fourth meeting of GMDA which was held under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Manohar Lal here approved the DPR. Public Works (Building and Roads) Minister, Rao Narbir Singh, Urban Local Bodies Minister, Kavita Jain, Transport Minister, Krishan Lal Panwar and MLA Gurugram Umesh Aggarwal were present in the meeting.

"The metro project would not help in decongestion of roads but also save vehicle operation cost and time of passengers significantly. The Authority has also approved Comprehensive Drainage Plan for Gurugram at an estimated cost of Rs 160 crore," said an official spokesman.

During the meeting, it was informed that this metro

project would be implemented by Haryana Mass Rapid Transport Corporation (HMRTC). The total length of metro rail line would be 31.11 kilometers and it would have 25 stations and six interchange stations. This metro line would be constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 5,126 crore and is likely to be made operational in the year 2023.

The metro stations which have been proposed on this route are HUDA City Centre, Sector 45, Cyber Park, Sector 46, Sector 47, Sector 48, Technology Park, Udyog Vihar Phase 6, Sector 10, Sector 37, Basai, Sector 9, Sector 7, Sector 4, Sector 5, Ashok Vihar, Sector 3, Krishna Chowk, Palam Vihar Extension, Palam Vihar, Sector 23 A, Sector 22, Udyog Vihar Phase IV and V and Cyber City.

It has also been decided that track integration between metro corridor and rapid metro would be considered for continuous operations, the spokesman said.

It was informed that Gurugram Metropolitan City Bus Limited has written to the State Transport Authority for issue of permits for commencing services from Gurugram to Faridabad during the peak hours.

Apart from this, two routes have been identified for commencing service from Gurugram to Delhi (Dhaura Kuan and Dwarka).

An arrangement of 25 buses has been made for this purpose. As many as 81 buses are already plying on six routes in Gurugram under the City Bus Service.

The Chief Minister directed that suggestions from the general public should be taken while finalizing routes so that maximum people could avail the benefit of this

bus service.

Manohar Lal also directed the officers concerned to prepare a 'zero drain out system' for Gurugram for storage of maximum water. He was apprized that a comprehensive drainage Plan for Gurugram would be taken up in a phased manner. The plan would include creation of water harvesting structures, pondage areas and channelization of creeks and creation of Leg IV (Vatika Chowk, Sohna road upto Railway culvert-61) and construction of recharge wells from SPR to Railway culvert 61. A sum of Rs 160 crore would be spent in the next two years for this purpose. It was further informed that identified water bodies in the district are being rejuvenated. For this, the water bodies are being connected to the storm water drains, the spokesman said.

He said that that all the residential buildings having roof top measuring over 100 square meters in Gurugram would have rain water harvesting system.

Directions have been issued to ensure that water harvesting systems already installed in the buildings are operational. Similarly, those who have not yet installed the rain water harvesting system, have been asked to make arrangement for the same, for which rate has also been fixed by Municipal Corporation.

The Chief Minister was also informed that the GMDA has approved the proposal for allotment of land measuring 8 acres in Sector 52 A, Gurugram on lease to the Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) to be constituted by GMDA and Haryana State Agricultural Marketing Board (HSAMB) for the construction of Flower Market.

Apart from this, a state level employees sammelan will be organized on June 22 at Kurukshetra to decide next course of action, Punia said.

# Kunwar Vijay Pratap to head SIT probing firing incidents

Soon after the model code of conduct ended, IG Kunwar Vijay Pratap Singh was back into the SIT probing into the sacrilege cases and the unprovoked incidents of sacrilege & police firing that had rocked Punjab under the SAD-BJP regime.

He was shifted out of the post when model code of conduct was in force in the state after a complaint by the Shiromani Akali Dal. Two people were killed and many others injured in Behbal Kalan village on October 15, 2015, when police resorted to unprovoked firing on hundreds of people protesting the alleged desecration of the Guru Granth Sahib in Bargari village in Faridkot a few days earlier. The incident came a day after police used force to disperse agitators in Kotkapura village.

Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh, who also heads the Home Department, had, during his election campaign, announced that Vijay Pratap would be back to complete and take the SIT investigations to their logical conclusion the day after the election code of conduct is lifted. It may be noted that the code of conduct formally ended on Sunday evening.

In the orders issued on Monday, Home Secretary NS Kalsi said Kunwar Vijay Pratap Singh is transferred and posted as IGP, OCCU (Organised Crime Control Unit), with Additional Charge of IGP, Counter Intelligence, Amritsar.

The IG had been posted to Counter Intelligence after he was shifted out of OCCU on EC orders for alleged violation of the model code of conduct, a charge which even the Chief Minister had stated as incorrect.

Kunwar Vijay Pratap Singh was an active part of the SIT investigations into the Bargari and other sacrilege incidents, and the subsequent Behbal Kalan and Kotkapura firing, when he was shunted out by EC orders.

Capt Amarinder had alleged the orders were issued at the behest of the ruling BJP - an ally of the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD), whose top leaders, including the Badals, have figured in the investigations so far. The Ranjit Singh Commission, set up by the Captain Amarinder government to probe the cases, had suggested further investigation into the role of the Badals, which the SIT was further probing.

The chief minister has repeatedly maintained that the firing on peaceful protesters could not have been possible without the knowledge of then Chief Minister Prakash Singh Badal and then Deputy CM Sukhbir Badal, who also held the Home portfolio. The Chief Minister has promised stringent action, as per the law, against those found culpable by the SIT.

## Hry to conduct entrance test for 'Super 30'

The Manohar Lal Khattar Government in Haryana will be conducting a written examination on June 10 under the 'Super 100' initiative to provide free coaching for JEE, NEET and boarding facility to meritorious students of government schools.

The students who have attained more than 80 percent marks in class 10th would be eligible to participate in the entrance test. The last date of registration students for this programme is May 31.

Selected students in examination will be provided free of cost training for NEET, IIT and JEE by the State Government, a spokesman of the Department said.

of boarding and lodging would also be borne by the government. All the district education officers have been directed by the Directorate of School Education to appoint the district Science expert and district Math expert in their respective districts as the nodal officer of the 'Super-100' programme.

The Directorate has also directed to establish contact with Parents, School Heads and students who secured more than 80 per cent marks in

Class X to encourage them to come for 'Super-100' programme, the spokesman said.

More than 100 students will be enrolled under the programme to undergo the complete two years free of cost training for medical and engineering competitive entrance exams. Equal number of girls and boys are proposed to be enrolled under the scheme.

Notably, a total of 3.64 lakh candidates had appeared out of which 57.39 percent passed in the Haryana Board Class 10 examination. The pass percentage has gone up by six points compared to last year's 51.15 percent.

However, the poor show continued as 1.4 lakh students failed the exams, while another 18,000 got compartments in class X in the state.

## After his defeat Jakhar sends resignation to Rahul Gandhi

After losing the Gurdaspur seat to BJP's Sunny Deol, Sunil Jakhar has sent his resignation as Punjab Congress chief to party president Rahul Gandhi, taking moral responsibility for the loss.

In the letter, Jakhar mentioned that despite support of party's senior leadership, including Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra and Chief Minister Amarinder Singh, he could not retain the seat.

The ruling Congress in Punjab won eight out of 13 parliamentary seats in the state, bucking the pro-Modi trend.

Jakhar had won the Gurdaspur Lok Sabha seat in the bypolls in October 2017. The seat had fallen vacant after the death of BJP MP Vinod Khanna.

In the letter, Jakhar mentioned that despite support of party's senior leadership, including Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra and Chief Minister Amarinder Singh, he could not retain the seat

The Congress leader had then defeated BJP's Swaran Salaria by a margin of over 1.93 lakh votes. However, Jakhar lost the seat this time to actor-turned-politician Deol by a margin of 82,459 votes.

Five years ago, Jakhar, who was then Punjab Congress Legislature Party leader, had submitted resignation from the post after losing the Ferozepur Lok Sabha seat.

However, his resignation was rejected by then party president Sonia Gandhi.

## 7TH ECONOMIC CENSUS

### State-level training exercise held

In the run up to upcoming 7th Economic Census, a one-day state level training workshop of the trainers from Punjab was organised here on Monday.

Inaugurating the event, Director, Statistics and Planning Department Chandigarh Harish Nayar said the participants were trained on the key concepts and definitions, processes, digital platform and application to be used for the enumeration (data capture and supervision) in the field.

M.L. Sharma, Economic Adviser and Planning, Punjab said that the census would cover all entrepreneurial units in the state which are involved in any economic activities of either agricultural or non-agricultural sector which are engaged in production, distribution of goods and services not for the sole purpose of own consumption.

The task would provide detailed information on operational and other characteristics such as number of establishments, number of persons employed, source of finance, type of ownership etc. and this information would be utilized for micro level planning and to assess contribution of various sectors of the economy in the GDP, he added.

An official spokesman said that the 7th Economic Census -2019 is being conducted by Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) to provide dis-aggregated information on various operational and structural aspects of all establishments in the country. He further said that the fieldwork for the 7th Economic Census will commence in June 2019 in order to complete the task in a time frame of three months.

He said that Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) has partnered with Common Service Centres, CSC e-Governance Services India Limited, a Special Purpose Vehicle under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology as the implementing agency for 7th Economic Census. An IT based digital platform for data capture, validation, report generation and dissemination will be used in this Economic Census.

About 200 participants from Central and State Govt. Offices namely Regional Offices of Mohali & Jalandhar and their Sub Regional Offices, Punjab State-Industries Dept., Punjab State-Economic and Statistics and District Managers & District Coordinator of CSC also participated in the workshop.

## Temperatures hover above normal in Hry, Pb

The maximum temperatures at most places in Haryana and Punjab including their common capital Chandigarh hovered above the season's average on Monday.

Similarly, Hisar recorded a maximum of 41.1 degrees Celsius while Karnal's maximum settled at 40.6 degrees Celsius.

In Punjab's holy city of Amritsar, the mercury rose to 40.2 degrees Celsius while Ludhiana and Patiala recorded near similar maximum temperatures at 40.7 degrees Celsius and 40.8 degrees Celsius respectively, up by one degree each against normal.

Meanwhile, as per the MeT Department, no respite is in sight as the weather is likely to remain dry over the next four days in Punjab and Haryana.

## Punjab jumps to 3rd rank under Gramin Awas Yojna

Punjab Rural Development and Panchayat and Housing and Urban Development Minister Tript Rajinder Singh Bajwa on Monday said that Punjab has been ranked three among the states at the national level under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Gramin).

Anurag Verma, Financial Commissioner, Rural Development and Panchayats said a sum of Rs 1.2 lacs is given to eligible beneficiaries under this scheme.

## Poland national arrested by Haryana Police

Haryana Police has arrested a Poland national from Gurugram and recovered 345 gram opium and 4.285 kg charas from his possession.

The arrested accused is identified as Patryk, 28, a resident of Poland.

Giving details, a spokesman of the Police Department on Monday said that a team of DLF Phase-1 police station, during patrolling, had spotted two suspicious youth, who suddenly started running away after seeing police. The alert police chased and nabbed one person at a short distance whereas another youth managed to escape after throwing a bag.

Upon searching, police has recovered 345 gram opium from arrested accused and 4.285 kg charas from the bag thrown by another accused. The arrested Poland resident failed to produce passport and Visa, the spokesman said.

During preliminary interrogation, arrested accused revealed that he had come to India on tourist visa 7-8 months ago, he said.

The accused came to know that there are many places in Himachal Pradesh where a large number of foreign nationals come and stay for long periods and intoxicants also becomes available on cheap rates. Then he went to Kullu in Himachal Pradesh. He stayed there in different places. During this period, he came in contact with Kazi, a resident of Kullu (the accused who had managed to flee) who is also addicted to drugs. Arrested accused is a musician and performs in parties. In Delhi, he has performed live music in many parties, the spokesman said.

When all his money was spent, his partner told him that they can earn more money by sale of narcotics in Delhi at an expensive price to meet their expenses, he said.

A case under relevant sections of NDPS and Foreigners Act was registered against him. Efforts are on to nab another accused and further investigation is under progress, the spokesman said.

## Hry CM to expedite projects ahead of Assembly polls

Buoyed by party's big victory in Lok Sabha polls 2019 in Haryana, the Chief Minister Manohar Lal who is heading the BJP Government in the state has already begun preparations for the State Assembly polls due to be held in October this year.

Panipat, Kaithal, Rewari, Bhiwani, Thanesar, Bahadurgarh, Palwal, Sirsa and Jind, said an official spokesman. Projects including strengthening of the drinking water supply system, strengthening the drainage system and sewerage management, rain water drainage management, urban transport among others are undertaken in these cities under AMRUT scheme, he

said.

The Chief Minister will preside over five sessions in the day-long meetings to review the AMRUT mission, status of smart city project, status of implementation of his announcements. Urban Local Bodies Minister Kavita Jain, senior bureaucrats, Mayor and other representatives of the city would attend the meeting, the spokesman added.

On Monday also, the Chief Minister reviewed the progress of metro projects in the state.

After the BJP had won all 10 Lok Sabha seats in Haryana, the Chief Minister Manohar Lal had recently said that his government's priority will be to speed up the development projects in Haryana, which will go to State Assembly polls in next three-four months.

In the 90-member State Assembly, the BJP currently has 48 MLAs.

Manohar Lal has already directed all the MLAs to expedite the progress of various development works or projects in their constituencies and ensure to fix a deadline for the completion of key projects.

# DUE TO DISSOLUTION OF LS Citizenship, triple talaq Bills lapse

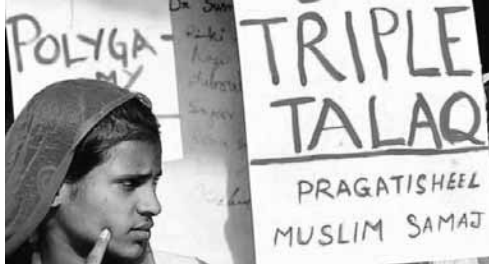

The new Government will have to bring the controversial Citizenship (Amendment) and Triple Talaq Bills once again as they lapsed due to the dissolution of the 16th Lok Sabha and the two legislations not being passed in the Rajya Sabha due to stiff Opposition.

The Government may continue with the contents of the Triple Talaq Bill but may consider minor changes in the Citizenship Bill taking into consideration opinions from the stakeholders in Assam and other North Eastern States.

The Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Bill which made the practice of instant triple talaq (talaq-e-biddat) a penal offence, was opposed by the opposition parties which had claimed that jail term for the husband for divorcing his wife is legally untenable.

The Government had pro-



mulgated the ordinance on triple talaq twice. Under the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Ordinance, 2019, divorcing through instant triple talaq will be illegal, void and would attract a jail term of three years for the husband.

A Bill to convert the earlier ordinance, issued in September 2018, was cleared by the Lok Sabha in December and was pending in the Rajya Sabha.

Since the Bill could not get parliamentary approval, a fresh

ordinance was issued. Seeking to allay fears that the proposed law could be misused, the Government has included certain safeguards in it such as adding a provision for bail for the accused during trial.

These amendments were cleared by the Cabinet on August 29, 2018. While the ordinance makes it a "non-bailable" offence, an accused can approach a magistrate even before trial to seek bail. In a non-bailable offence, bail cannot be granted by police at the police station itself. A provision was

added to allow the magistrate to grant bail "after hearing the wife", the Government had said.

The Citizenship (Amendment) Bill, 2019 provided for according Indian citizenship to Hindus, Jains, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists and Parsis from Bangladesh, Pakistan and Afghanistan after seven years of residence in India instead of 12 years, which is the current norm, even if they do not possess any document. The legislation was passed by Lok Sabha during the Winter Session on January 8 but could not be cleared by the upper house. There has been strong Opposition to the bill in Assam and other Northeastern States.

Student organisations, political parties and socio-cultural bodies have been protesting on the grounds that it seeks to grant nationality to non-Muslims who have come into India up to December 31, 2014, thereby increasing the deadline from 1971 as per the Assam Accord.

# Centre to identify tribals who fled due to Salwa Judum movement

New Delhi: The Centre will ask the Telangana and Andhra Pradesh Governments to identify tribals who allegedly fled Chhattisgarh due to the Salwa Judum movement around 15 years ago and settled there, according to officials.

Salwa Judum was a militia that had been deployed as part of anti-Maoist operations in Chhattisgarh. It was operational between 2005 and 2011, before it was banned by the Supreme Court.

The action came on a complaint of an NGO, CGNet Swara Foundation, that wrote to the ministry claiming that over 5,000 families had fled Chhattisgarh due to the controversial militia force formed by late Congress leader Mahendra Karma in mid-2005 to counter the Maoists.

"We received a complaint on May 12 stating that a number of tribal families fled to Andhra Pradesh and Telangana from Chhattisgarh due to Salwa Judum. We have to take all state



governments on board and verify these cases," a senior official of the Tribal Affairs Ministry said.

"Once the verification process is completed, we will sit together and decide the next course of action. We will have to see what political stand the Chhattisgarh government will take on it... Whether it acknowledges that these were families were displaced due to Salwa Judum," the official said.

Another official from Chhattisgarh said that once it is established that these families belonged to the state, a process can be initiated to rehabilitate them under the

Forest Rights Act, 2006.

Experts say the previous BJP-led administration had backed the movement and the Congress government at the Centre was seized of it.

The Supreme Court banned the militia force in 2011 after it acquired a notorious reputation for allegedly burning villages, killing people and sexually assaulting women after terming them Maoist sympathisers.

According to CGNet Swara Foundation, the militia force led to the displacement of 5,000 families from Chhattisgarh. These families settled in Andhra Pradesh, which got bifurcated in 2014.

The NGO claimed these families had been living with-out basic facilities in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, and could not benefit from the Forest Rights Act, which provides for giving land rights to those living on forest land for at least three generations before December 31, 2005.

# New version of Akash missile test-fired successfully

New Delhi: India on Monday successfully test fired an Akash-MK-15 missile from the integrated test range at Chandipur in Odisha, the Defence Ministry said on Monday.

The surface-to-air anti-aircraft missile with a strike range of 25 km and capability to carry warhead of 60 kg was test fired on May 25 and May 27, they said.

"Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully test fired AKASH-MK-15 missile from ITR, Chandipur, Odhisa on May 25 and 27," the defence ministry said in a statement.

It said the Akash weapon system has combination of both command guidance and active terminal seeker guidance.

"Seeker and guidance performance have been consistently established in both the missions. All the mission objectives have been met," the Ministry said. PTI

### GOVT BODY TO MULL TO CONTINUE BAN ON LTTE



New Delhi: The Centre on Monday set up a tribunal for adjudicating whether or not there is sufficient reason to continue the ban on the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE), a fortnight after it extended for five years the proscription of the terror group that was behind the assassination of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi.

# Locals to be educated about tigers, humans coexistence

Months after its big cat relocation plan in Odisha's Satkosia Tiger reserve went haywire, the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) has now decided to showcase the locals examples of other tiger habitats where villagers are peacefully co-habiting with the wild animals.

The locals had fiercely opposed the relocation of Sundari, a tigress and Mahaveer, a tiger, in the Satkosia forest from Madhya Pradesh last year. The area had witnessed serious law and order problem when Sundari allegedly killed two persons. She has been held captive since then by wildlife authorities. For his part, Mahaveer fell to poaching.

Since then the tiger relocation plan has been put on hold by the NTCA.

Now realising that its relocation plan will not see the light of the day unless locals are engaged in the conservation plan, the top tiger body last week shot off a letter to the Chief Wildlife Warden of Odisha to organise a tour/exposure visit for capacity building of local community and forest officials of Satkosia Tiger



Reserve to Terai Arc landscape comprising of Corbett Tiger Reserve in Uttarakhand and Pilibhit Tiger Reserve in Uttarakhand.

The NTCA preferred to chose the two tiger reserves as it felt they were "very good examples of conservation where movement of tigers in human dominated areas has been monitored with involvement of local communities and forest departments of both the States have successfully ensured the rehabilitation of tigers back to forest areas."

During the tour, the locals will be educated to how to live peacefully with the animals and how they can earn their livelihood.

The move is in keeping with the NTCA guidelines which envisage involvement of local people in conservation for fulfilling the agenda of co-exis-

tence in buffer or fringe areas. "People's involvement becomes more crucial in tiger relocated sites like Satkosia tiger reserve where local communities are historically dependent on these forests. Therefore it is quite relevant to ensure role of local communities as co-partners in conservation instead of just passive stakeholders."

"To achieve this, capacity building of local communities is very important so as to seek their active participation in conservation to achieve the co-existence agenda while minimizing man-animal conflicts," said the NTCA letter.

The tigress Sundari was brought from Bandhavgarh on June 28 last year while tiger Mahaveer was brought from Kanha in Madhya Pradesh to Satkosia Tiger Reserve in July last year. Mahaveer's carcass was found on November 15.

# BSP MP Rai faces arrest for rape post apex court call

New Delhi: In a setback to newly elected BSP MP Atul Rai, the Supreme Court on Monday refused to grant him protection from arrest in a rape case while noting that 16 other criminal cases were pending against him.

A vacation bench of Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and Justice Aniruddha Bose said it was not inclined to entertain the petition of Rai, who has won Lok Sabha election from Ghosi constituency in Uttar Pradesh by a margin of more than one lakh votes.

At the outset, the bench asked the counsel for Rai about the number of criminal cases were pending against him.

The counsel replied that the MP had 16 criminal cases pending against him and he was out on bail in all the cases except the rape case.

The counsel also said that Rai had sought that the FIR against him in the rape case be quashed.

"Sorry, we are not inclined to entertain this petition. Dismiss," the bench said.

The counsel then sought to withdraw the petition which was allowed by the court.

Counsel for the petitioner seeks leave of this Court to withdraw the

present special leave petition. The special leave petition is dismissed as withdrawn," the bench said.

Earlier on May 17, the apex court had refused to grant interim protection from arrest to Rai who was then a SP-BSP alliance candidate from Ghosi Lok Sabha constituency in Uttar Pradesh.

Rai, who was accused of raping a college student from Varanasi had then sought interim protection from arrest saying polling in his constituency was scheduled on May 19.

"It is not a case for quashing. Fight it out. Fight the election and this case too," the top court had told him.

An FIR was registered against Rai on May 1 on a complaint by a college student who had alleged that he took her home on the pretext of meeting his wife but sexually assaulted her. The SP-BSP alliance candidate, who has denied the rape allegations, has been on the run since the lodging of the FIR.

Rai had contended that there was no provision of anticipatory bail in Uttar Pradesh and the high court had on May 8 dismissed his petition seeking protection from arrest.

# Plea challenging HC verdict on power to arrest in GST evasion cases dismissed

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Monday dismissed a plea challenging the Telangana High Court verdict that a person can be arrested by the concerned authority in cases of Goods and Service Tax (GST) evasion.

The plea came up for hearing before a vacation bench of Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and Justice Aniruddha Bose and the apex court said it was not inclined to interfere with the April 18 judgement of the high court.

"Having heard counsel for the petitioner and upon perusing the relevant material, we are not inclined to interfere. The special leave petition is accordingly dismissed," the bench said.

On April 18, the high court had said it was not inclined to grant relief against arrest to the petitioners who had approached it challenging the summons issued by Superintendent (Anti-Evasion) of the Hyderabad GST Commissionerate under the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 and invocation of penal provisions under the law.

The high court had delivered the verdict which dealing with a batch of petitions filed by some private companies, its top officials and others.

The Government had told the high court that petitioners before it were allegedly involved in incorporating several partnership firms and had claimed input tax credit on the basis of certain invoices, without there being any actual physical receipt of goods.

It had alleged that the fraudulent input tax credit claimed by them was to the tune of ₹224.05 crore. PTI



# NIA court convicts four members of Bodo insurgent group for 2014 terror attack

New Delhi: Four members of Bodo insurgent group NDFB(S) were convicted by a special NIA court in Guwahati on Monday for a terror attack in Assam's Kokrajhar district in 2014 in which five tribals were killed, officials said.

Bina Basumatary, Jayanta Mushahary, Dwithai Basumatary and Khanda Daimary were sentenced to five years imprisonment and a fine was imposed on each of them, an NIA spokesperson said here.

"The case pertains to the terrorist attack on 23.12.2014 by NDFB(S)

cadres upon innocent people of Pakiriguri village under Serfanguri Police Station in Kokrajhar district of Assam, in which five adivasis were killed and another five sustained grievous injuries due to indiscriminate firing by the terrorist group," he said.

He said one of the accused Gautam Mahalia had earlier pleaded guilty in April 2019.

"He was sentenced to 4.5 years. Trial against 10 other accused persons who are in judicial custody will continue," the spokesperson said. PTI

# Delhi HC asks ED to reply against Talwar's interim bail plea

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court on Monday asked the Enforcement Directorate (ED) to file a reply on a plea by corporate lobbyist Deepak Talwar, an accused in a money-laundering case, seeking interim bail on medical grounds.

Justice Chander Shekhar also asked the jail authorities to file a medical report of Talwar and listed the matter for May 30 for further hearing. The court also directed the jail superintendent to provide necessary medical treatment to Talwar.

Talwar has been accused by the ED of acting as a middleman in negotiations to favour foreign private airlines over seat-sharing on Air India's profitable routes.

The ED is also probing various other cases related to money-laundering

against Talwar, who was deported from the United Arab Emirates (UAE) on January 30. Meanwhile, another division bench headed by Chief Justice Rajendra Menon asked Talwar's son Aditya to appear before the ED and satisfy it.

The bench's direction came after it was informed that Aditya was a "fugitive". The court was hearing Wave Hospitality Ltd's plea challenging a notice related to provisional attachment of its hotel in Aerocity area. The ED told the court that Aditya Talwar is connected with Wave Hospitality and since he is a "fugitive" from law, the company's plea should not be heard. But the company said that Talwar was neither one of its directors nor a shareholder.

# Grammar of electoral politics has changed, says BJP leader

BJP vice-president Vinay Sahasrabudde on Monday said the grammar of electoral politics has changed in the country with development and nationalism taking centre stage in the political discourse.

The massive mandate has given a "body blow" to the established norms of politics in the country, he said.

The BJP won 303 of the 542 Lok Sabha seats that went to polls this time while the Opposition was left way behind with the Congress winning only 52 seats, two less than it needs for the Leader of Opposition post in the Lower House.

The discourse of politics was earlier confined to "socialism, welfarism and patronage",

but now development and nationalism dominate it, the BJP leader claimed.

"The 2019 election's result is a watershed mandate. It has changed the very grammar of electoral politics in India. Traditional discourse of politics earlier used to remain confined to socialism, welfarism and patronage."

"This time it has gone far beyond all this as people have realised that development alone can bring a real change in their lives," Sahasrabudde said.

Development and nationalism are now the centre stage of the country's political discourse, he added.

Sahasrabudde underlined that this verdict has cornered identity politics and a new model of politics engineered by

the BJP based on development and nationalism has emerged.

The Modi government has ensured that development becomes a part of one's everyday life bringing it at the experiential level, the BJP vice president said.

Development has also given people a new aspirational identity.

Instead of being known by their caste, they feel better to be identified as those who have gas cylinders or electricity at their homes, he said, adding that this has enhanced their social dignity as well.

Sahasrabudde, who is the president of the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), is in-charge of BJP's policy research and good governance departments.

# BJP nominates Kamakhya Tasa for RS from Assam

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

With the Lok Sabha results out, the BJP on Monday named Kamakhya Prasad Tasa as its candidate for the Rajya Sabha elections in Assam.

Tasa, who has long been associated with the BJP and working for tea garden workers, was elected to the Lok Sabha in 2014 from the Jorhat seat, but the party did not field him in this general election.

The party has not named the candidate for the second seat from the State, but it may support its Assam ally AGP for this.

There has been speculation that the BJP may back Union Minister Ram Vilas Paswan, its ally in Bihar, for one of the seats in Assam after it promised to send him to the Rajya Sabha at the earliest opportunity during seat sharing talks for the Lok Sabha polls.

Paswan did not contest the general elections this time.

The Congress held the seats, includ-

in Bihar and Maharashtra. It has fielded Radha Mohan Sharma from Bihar and Pruthvi Raj Deshmukh from Maharashtra.

The election of party president Amit Shah, Union Ministers Ravi Shankar Prasad and Smriti Irani, currently members of the Rajya Sabha to the Lok Sabha, would leave three more

vacancies in the upper house for the BJP. Shah, 54, was elected to the Upper House of Parliament in August 2017, making his parliamentary debut.

He won his first Lok Sabha election from the Gandhinagar constituency by a margin of over 5.57 lakh votes against his nearest rival Congress' C J Chavda.

Irani, 43, who had earlier also served as an HRD Minister and I&B Minister in the Modi Government, proved herself to be a giant-killer as she dethroned Congress chief Rahul Gandhi in Amethi by a margin of 55,120 votes, while Prasad, 64, dislodged sitting MP and former BJP member Shatrughan Sinha who fought on a Congress ticket by a margin of over 2.84 lakh in Patna Sahib constituency.

The TV actor-turned-politician had twice fought the Lok Sabha election unsuccessfully in 2004, losing to Congress leader Kapil Sibal in Chandni Chowk constituency and in 2014 suffered defeat at the hands of Rahul Gandhi in Amethi.



# RJD MLA demands Tejashwi's resignation

The simmering discontent in RJD has come to the fore following its rout in Lok Sabha election with a senior party legislator Maheshwar Prasad Yadav on Monday asking Tejashwi Yadav to resign from the post of Leader of Opposition taking moral responsibility of the drubbing.

Alleging that parivarwad (family politics) has cost the party most, Maheshwar, RJD MLA from Gaihat Assembly constituency in Muzaffarpur district, claimed the party will break if his demand is not fulfilled.

As a party MLA, I would request Tejashwi Yadav to resign from the post of LOP taking moral responsibility of the Lok Sabha poll debacle and appoint any other senior party leader hailing from a caste other than Yadav to the post of LOP, failing which the party will have to face crushing defeat in 2020 Assembly elections, he told reporters.

The RJD is the second party of the five members mahagathbandhan to face the heat of resounding defeat in the hands of NDA in Bihar.

Except for one seat of Kisanganj won by the Congress, the BJP, JD(U) and LJP combine bagged 39 out of a total 40 Lok Sabha seats in Bihar.

Earlier, Upendra Kushwaha led RLPs three legislators — two MLAs and one MLC — merged with the JD(U) on Sunday following the massive drubbings at the hustings.

someone else as LOP) is not fulfilled, then the legislature party will break as party's several legislators are with me, Maheshwar Prasad Yadav claimed.

Asked whether he has the support of two-third of RJD legislature party to avoid defecation law, he answered in affirmative saying that he has the support of large numbers of party MLAs as no one wants to board the sinking ship...But please, don't ask me the names and numbers at the moment.

Asked whether he would attend the two-day RJD meeting scheduled to be held on May 28 and 29 to discuss the poll debacle, the rebel MLA said he would not participate in the meeting till his demand (Tejashwi resignation) is met.

Maheshwar, who has been seen in close company of Bihar CM Nitish Kumar in the recent past, said Lalu Prasad's affection for his family cost the party most and the party (RJD) would not have staged a come-

back in the 2015 Assembly polls, if the RJD would not have stitched an alliance with Kumar's JD(U).

It was because of Kumar that the RJD came to power in 2015 in the State, he said, adding but the party supremo again chose to anoint his both sons as Deputy CM and Minister in Nitish Kumar-led Grand Alliance Government ignoring senior party leaders.

When Nitish Kumar parted his ways, RJD chief again foisted his son Tejashwi and wife Rabri Devi as LOP in lower and upper house respectively. I had opposed the party chiefs move to make Rabri Devi as the CM in 1997 and had suggested him to appoint any other senior leader of the party as CM but he ignored my opinion. There was a time when the party was reduced to 22 MLAs and four MPs. But people in recently held general elections have thoroughly rejected the RJD for carrying out 'parivarwad' politics, the MLA added.

# Deve Gowda holds talks with K'taka Cong chief

Former Prime Minister and JD(S) supremo HD Deve Gowda had a discussion with Karnataka Congress chief Dinesh Gundu Rao on Monday, following the combine's rout in the just-concluded Lok Sabha election.

After the meeting that lasted for over an hour, Rao told reporters that Deve Gowda had asked him to come home to discuss various issues. He, however, refused to divulge what transpired between the former Prime Minister and him.

"I cannot disclose what discussion we had because he has said something outright about the two parties. We will have to take certain decisions after discussing with the senior leaders in our party," Rao said.



The Congress and the Janata Dal (Secular) only managed to win one seat each of the 28 in Karnataka, while the BJP won 25 seats. The other seat was bagged by BJP-backed Independent candidate Sumalatha Ambareesh, who defeated Deve Gowda's grandson Nikhil Kumaraswamy in Mandya. Deve Gowda too lost from

Tumkur. BJP leaders have predicted the collapse of the Congress-JD(S) coalition in Karnataka and an increase in the saffron party's tally in the Assembly after the Lok Sabha poll results, claiming that 20-odd Congress MLAs

were unhappy with the State Government.

The Deve Gowda-Rao meeting comes amid coalition worries and discontent within the Congress, with its MLA Ramesh Jarkiholi, who has been rubbing shoulders with

the BJP for some time, even threatening to resign, along with a few other lawmakers.

The Congress has convened a meeting of its legislature party on Wednesday to discuss the political developments in the southern State.

## JD(S)-Cong Govt strong: Siddaramiah

Bengaluru: Former Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramiah on Monday asserted that the JD(S)-Congress Government was a 'strong' one and ridiculed State BJP president BS Yeddyurappa for repeatedly claiming that the coalition will collapse.

In a series of tweets, he also said the people's mandate was for continuation of the BJP-led Government at the

Centre and not for 'toppling' the State Government.

"Yeddyurappa has been saying for the past one year the Government will fall. He will continue to say the same for the next four years. I am confident the Government is strong," Siddaramiah said.

Referring to Prime Minister Narendra Modi working the Constitution after being elected leader of the BJP-led NDA

on Saturday, he sought to know which article in the Constitution gave the BJP the right to topple a State Government.

Siddaramiah said the outcome of the Lok Sabha elections, in which the BJP won 25 seats, was for continuation of the NDA Government at the Centre and not for toppling the Government in the State and make Yeddyurappa Chief Minister again. PTI

# UP Cabinet to meet today

After almost a month-and-a-half, the much awaited Cabinet meeting of the Yogi Adityanath Government will be held on Tuesday in which the state government is expected to finalise the transfer policy and take decisions on pending issues.

Sources say the Cabinet may finalise the transfer policy whose nitty-gritty awaits Cabinet nod.

Generally, the deadline for transfer ends on May 31 but this year the deadline is sure to increase.

The Cabinet will decide the modalities as generally only 10 per cent of the staff are transferred and the policy also contains many riders.

The spokesman said the government may also take decision on wheat purchase and set guidelines for the construction of Purvanchal and Bundelkhand expressways.

"There are around a dozen issues which need Cabinet approval and these will be dis-

## Rahul Gandhi to visit Wayanad in first week of June

Thiruvananthapuram: Congress president Rahul Gandhi would visit Wayanad in the first week of June to thank the electorate for his record breaking win from this Lok Sabha seat in Kerala, said a Congress leader on Monday.

Leader of Opposition Ramesh Chennithala said this after the Congress-led United Democratic Front (UDF) met for the first time after registering a resounding victory in the Lok Sabha polls, winning all but one of the 20 seats in the State.

A source in the know of things said Rahul Gandhi's visit could be either on Saturday or Monday.

Rahul won with the highest ever margin of victory in any Lok Sabha election with 4,31,770 votes.

He defeated his nearest rival PP Suneer of the Communist Party of India who secured 2,74,597 votes while Congress president received 7,06,367 votes.

"This huge victory has placed more responsibility on us and we assure the people that this victory will not get into their heads. They will always work for people of the State," said Chennithala. IANS

## Three held over killing of Amethi BJP worker

Three suspects have been arrested in connection with the killing of a BJP worker in Amethi two days ago, police said on Monday.

Director General of Police (DGP) OP Singh said there was a local-level political rivalry between the deceased, Surendra Singh, 50, and the father of one of the accused.

"We have arrested three persons. After the incident was reported, as many as seven people were taken into custody and they were thoroughly quizzed," Singh told reporters here. "Among the seven people, there were three who were linked with the incident."

Amethi Superintendent of Police Rajesh Kumar said those arrested have been identified as Ramchandra, Dharmanath and Naseem, while two persons were absconding.

Singh, a close aide of newly-elected Amethi MP Smriti Irani, was shot when he was sleeping in his house at Baraulia village, 25 km from the district headquarters, on Saturday night. The former village head was referred to a Lucknow hospital, but succumbed to injuries during treatment.

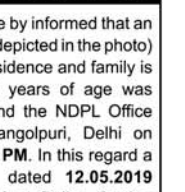

While Pak may try peacenik moves with a call for dialogue, India is right to stick to 'no terror' clause



One of the news reports before the outcome of the Indian elections was about a dipstick among Pakistanis, where some expatriates hoped Prime Minister Narendra Modi would return so that the scourge of terrorism could be finally wiped out from their home country. Whatever the nature of this back-handed compliment, it sort of bears out why Pakistan's Prime Minister Imran Khan, too, thought a Modi-led stable government in India would be decisive enough to do business with. And though widely seen as a puppet prince foisted by the fundamentalists and the military, one would on the face of it think that there would be some remnants of his Oxford-groomed liberalism that perhaps wished Modi's muscularity, fed by Pakistan-groomed terror networks, to force a change of domestic policy and maybe pitch economics higher than geopolitics as a doable proposition. But beyond this facetiousness, what really bothers Khan is his wavering conviction whether he could justify a proxy war with India anymore. Simply because the world, too, where Pakistan has been selling the Kashmir cause as a bargaining chip for exporting terror, has now turned against old tropes after the terrorist attack at Pulwama and the Balakot airstrikes. With Modi's victory, Khan has to live with the fact that anti-India histrionics of the past will have to be reinvented if he wants to perpetuate "India, the big boy in the hood" theory. Particularly when its friendly saviour China, too, after allowing the UN listing of Jaish chief Masood Azhar as a global terrorist, has made it clear that its relations with India and Pakistan would be single-point and have no areas of convergence. Besides, Modi's reminder that talks could only resume in the absence of terror clearly is intended to drive home the point that Balakot was not just a major electoral issue but would define the rules of engagement hereon. If there's a terrorist attack again, one can retaliate with a non-military hot pursuit of terrorist camps, staying well under the confrontation threshold. The perceived "morality" of attacking terror hubs, as has been practised by the US several times, is now acceptable.

In such a situation, Pakistan, by proposing the talks first, is trying to project itself as a practical neighbour and a first-mover in the peace process. It attempted this image makeover with grandiloquent talk of dialogue as the only civil way of resolution even during Balakot. Clearly, the conflict may have conflated the nature of nationalism as we knew it here but has badly affected Pakistan, which has been taken aback by India's new-found aggression and is engaging in sweet talk now. In such a situation, Modi is expected to maintain the conditional clause of linking terror with talks for some time, if only to appear righteous before the citizenry. Post-Kargil, he has successfully brought Pakistan's role in our woes of national security to the centre court. So he won't go against this narrative that easily knowing full well Pakistan is desperate to show some gains for its domestic audience, too. In fact, the Modi government, which has also cracked down on border trade in its earlier stint, will wait to see if Pakistan changes its tactics vis-a-vis India over a period of time. Though the IMF has released a package to a fund-starved Pakistan, the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) is still watching it. China will become the new FATF chief with tacit approval of the US and India and may not be seen as entirely favouring Pakistan. So, India is hoping to have Pakistan in a cleft stick and climb down on terms for a dialogue. Even assuming preposterously that both sides agree to dialogue at some stage in the future, there is no guarantee that Pakistan can rein in its "non-state actors", a euphemism for exported terrorists to keep its strategic relevance in the region. So subservient are the government and military to the fundamentalist lobby that they may not know what their other hand is doing. It is this duality that has pitchforked Pakistan as a key player in the Afghan peace talks and it is unlikely it will retreat. Besides, the growing IS network in Afghanistan is a worry for Pakistan itself. Many such talks between India and Pakistan have been sabotaged before and no amount of confidence-building measure has been able to take off. In the absence of pragmatism and a desire to resolve the Kashmir question genuinely, the suggestion of a dialogue is nothing better than a sounding board of ideas.

## Stop making demands

After staying away, Baba Ramdev has emerged with some bizarre ideas. The Govt should be cautious



Narendra Modi's stunning electoral victory has made his cheerleaders whoop with joy and rightly so, even some who remained oddly quiet this time around. But though there are still days to go before he is officially sworn in to his second term as Prime Minister, some of his cheerleaders have started to make some insane demands. Enter Baba Ramdev, who not only wants liquor sales banned but also wants to prevent the third child born to any family from having voting rights. There are

others, some washed-up Bollywood celebrities, talking of imposing strange cultural values and a perverted version of Hinduism upon the country and others still, who demand the expulsion of foreign companies from India. Frankly, India can't afford such crackpot ideas and the Prime Minister must let the slip from the suggestion box go straight into the wastepaper basket. While Modi's social programmes have been a winner, it is only the immense faith of the Indian people in him that did not lead to demonetisation being a political disaster, and that idea was not far removed from some of the suggestions he has received this time.

The Prime Minister, his Cabinet and his senior bureaucrats should, however, be open to good ideas that have been well-thought out and which can be implemented effectively. There are a slew of problems that face the nation — there is a jobs crisis, there is an agrarian distress, there is an impending environmental disaster with air and water let alone the fact that India will suffer most from global warming. The healthcare and educational systems, which are broken, will need to be fixed and, of course, there is that eternally vexing problem with Pakistan. There are far too many problems for India and India's decision-makers to deal with to get sidelined by crazy ideas and suggestions by those who claim to be fans and policy-setters by extension. The only fear though is that in the cacophony of bad ideas, a couple of them might actually slip through the filters and end up being implemented. Frankly, India does not have the time anymore to deal with the consequences of bad policies and ideas that get implemented. We have spent far too many decades debating stupid ideas, now is the time for decisive action on well-thought out ideas. Let the stupid ones die the natural deaths they deserve.

# opinion Reinventing the brand

Modi's victory marks a tectonic shift in the history of the republic. He may have seemed presidential but the spirit was republican

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is accused of making the 2019 general election a presidential race centred on his formidable personality and powerful oratory, thus ensuring the landslide victory of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) 303; NDA 353. However, his principal challenger, Congress chief Rahul Gandhi, made the contest monarchical with his family-driven rhetoric and entitlement brigade — scions of political families close to the Nehru-Gandhis, who owe their eminence to proximity. Rahul Gandhi's closest colleague is sister, Priyanka Vadra, and his political advisors and mentors (Digvijay Singh, Sam Pitroda) are also inherited.

The Congress was hobbled by this baggage. In an age of soaring aspirations and quest for equality, it was clueless how to appeal to rural or urban voters, women, youth, farmers, traders, entrepreneurs and professionals among others. Decision-making within the party has shrunk to closed door meetings with unknown membership and little regular communication with the rank and file. In contrast, BJP president Amit Shah kept the party on its toes round the year and gave tasks to every booth worker.

The result of the lustreless campaign is evident in the collapse of the political blue-blooded: Rahul Gandhi (Amethi), Sheila Dikshit, Jyotiraditya Scindia, Milind Deora, Jitin Prasad, Salman Khurshid, Ajay Maken, Kumari Shailja, Priya Dutt, Meira Kumar, Vaibhav Gehlot, Manvendra Singh, RPN Singh, Ashok Chavan, Bhupendra Hooda and son Deependra Hooda and Kirti Azad. Indeed, hereditary politicians fared badly across State-based political parties, virtually a guillotine by ballot box.

The more disturbing news for Congress is that it has been reduced to a fringe party, with a decent presence only in Punjab and Kerala. It drew a blank in Arunachal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland, Odisha, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tripura, Uttarakhand, Daman Diu, Dadra Nagar Haveli, Lakshadweep, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Chandigarh. A comeback would take a miracle. Meanwhile, the BJP vote share rose to over 50 per cent in several States.

The Left collapsed with the Congress, given its deep symbiotic relationship. The Leftist stranglehold over the media got huge coverage for Kanhaiya Kumar (CPI, Begusarai, Bihar), who was trounced. But public fatigue with the Left's shrill and negative rhetoric caused its fall from 59 seats in 2004, 26 in 2009, 10 in 2014 and five in 2019; recovery is unlikely.

Modi's success lay in shifting the electoral template away from the Nehruvian paradigm of default Muslim vote bank plus sprinkling of castes to fill the electoral kitty towards more inclusive voter participation. The process began in 2014 but was largely



ignored by analysts. Fine-tuned and implemented with greater vigour in 2019, it is being maligned as the rise of "majoritarianism." Western newspapers and their Indian echo chambers are warning of danger to minority groups. Yet none of these eminences ever criticised minority religious leaders, who asked their flocks not to vote for the BJP, thus tampering with the free will of voters and perverting the democratic system.

Simply put, Modi has removed the minority veto in the polity, a Nehruvian aberration that denied equality to the myriad groups comprising the non-monolithic Hindu community. Henceforth, minorities, like others, must vote as individuals on the issues of the day — nationalism, terrorism, farmer distress, budget and employment among others. The ancien régime, which pressured citizens to "vote your caste/community", while lampooning them for doing so, has made way for "vote your nation/issue". This caused the rout of the Samajwadi Party despite its pact with the Bahujan Samaj Party in Uttar Pradesh. The Congress won only Sonia Gandhi's seat, which means Priyanka Vadra (who failed to retain Amethi) may not win Rae Bareilly if Sonia Gandhi vacates it.

With hindsight, it seems amusing that Sonia Gandhi, Sharad Pawar and Telugu Desam Party's Chandrababu Naidu were so oblivious of the simmering Modi wave that they proposed a grand Opposition alliance in the event of BJP-NDA failing to win a clear majority and even wanted the President

to call the post-post alliance before the pre-poll pact. They cast aspersions on the integrity of the Electronic Voting Machines (EVM) even after dodging a previous challenge by the Election Commission to publicly demonstrate that the machines could be hacked. Sadly, former President Pranab Mukherjee joined this chorus and blotted his copybook.

The truth is that EVMs cannot be tampered without physically handling each machine (which is impossible). Each machine is an independent recording device with no internet connection and cannot be hacked via internet/Wi-Fi. The VVPAT trail found no discrepancies. Anyway, Chandrababu Naidu vanished after the TDP's rout; Trinamool Congress chief Mamata Banerjee was chastened. At its working committee meeting, the Congress agreed not to question the EVMs.

In Jammu and Kashmir, the National Conference won Anantnag (Hasnain Masoodi), Baramulla (Akbar Lone) and Srinagar (Farooq Abdullah) and the BJP won Jammu (Jugal Kishore), Udhampur (Jitendra Singh) and Ladakh (J.T. Namgyal). The People's Democratic Party's rout is a message to the BJP to fulfill its promise to abolish Articles 370 and 35-A, which only needs a Presidential order and political will. In Assembly elections later this year, if a coalition is necessary, the BJP must cut a deal equal to that crafted by the Congress when it gave the Chief Minister's post to Omar Abdullah. In Delhi Assembly

elections, the BJP must field leaders with an electoral base and shun paratroopers who ruined the party in 2015.

Modi has promised cooperation to the new Governments of Odisha, Sikkim, Andhra Pradesh and Arunachal Pradesh; they will naturally reciprocate in Parliament. For India as a whole, some urgent priorities include updating the National Register of Citizens, passing the Citizenship Amendment Bill to protect Hindus fleeing persecution or instability in the neighbourhood, giving equal rights to Hindu refugees languishing in Jammu and Kashmir and scrapping the discriminatory Right to Education Act or applying its provisions equally.

Above all, Modi must give priority to the economy by securing investments and increasing the pace of infrastructure development. Agriculture needs a rethink outside the discredited paradigm of costly fertilisers, pesticides and depleted water tables. The growing health consciousness in society will make organic farming feasible and remunerative.

Modi's victory marks a tectonic shift in the history of the republic. Unlike Rahul Gandhi, who embodied elected monarchy and had little to offer the citizen, Modi wove city and *chaupal* together in a grand narrative of nationalism, national resurgence and regeneration. He may have seemed presidential but the spirit was republican.

## Accelerators to boost Start-up India

An accelerator programme not only provides a business environment, it improves its immunity against market shocks

With 108 per cent growth in funding, entries of more than 1,200 new players and 40,000 additional workforce, the Indian start-up sector has witnessed a great revival in 2018 after the slowdown of 2016-17. As the majority of start-up entrepreneurs were young with an average age of 28 years, digital technology was the common growth factors among the successful ones. Today, the young breed of start-up founders is receptive and agile using AI, Blockchain, Big Data and IoT for improving their growth momentum. Amongst these innovative startups, there are hundreds of brands making a sharp groove not only in the domestic market but in international markets, too.

Impressed with the phenomenal growth of Indian start-ups in and outside the country, investors from all over the world, including America, Europe, Australia, and the Middle East, are now taking interest in disruptive Indian start-ups. From Asia, arch rivals like China and Japan are also watching them as a lucrative investment option. Most of the successful start-ups are taking birth in Tier-1 cities, and, due to their geographical and demographic merits, Bengaluru and Delhi-NCR occupy the top position in raising funds from private investors and VCs. But, despite enjoying the status of the financial capital of India, Mumbai is still in the third position. Consequently, investment into Indian start-ups has increased from \$ 2.03 billion in 2017 to \$ 4.2 billion in 2018. These positive changes brought a fresh life to more than 39K start-ups, the majority of them falling under Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) category, which is often referred to as the engine of the Indian economy. In addition, to achieve double-digit economic growth by 2020, both public and private institutions must come up with plans and schemes that may bolster the growing start-up culture in the country.

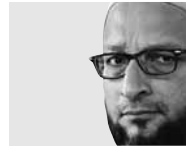
**Small businesses in Start-up India:** The Government's initiatives like Stand-up India and Start-up India resulted in a flourishing culture of small businesses across the country and reforms such as up to INR one crore loan in 59 minutes are indeed a commendable effort to push small businesses. On similar lines, many economists believe that CLCSTUS (Credit Linked Capital Subsidy Technical Upgradation Scheme) would do miracles for MSMEs. CLCSTUS, under which seven types of subsidies would be made available to the MSMEs, includes the majority of the start-ups that have come availing the Mudra loan scheme. Besides, such initiatives by the government will also induce private investors to take part in the growth of small businesses and providing funds to competitive players. The principal purposes behind the Start-up India and Stand-up India campaign were to promote a healthy entrepreneurial culture in the country, mass employment and faster economic growth. Though the response was tremendous in the first two years (2015-16), the move has lost the pace in the very third year. Lack of experience, guidance and support were the factors for this slowdown. Finally, the country realised that there is dire need of some good incubators and accelerators in the system to revive the pace of the moment. In the very next year (2018), under the guidance of incubators and accelerators, the sector has performed well on various fronts. Besides, helping young businesses with tax relaxation, subsidies, and other economic incentives, the Government must also take adequate steps to promote a culture of innovations in MSMEs and take appropriate decisions that may further improve business conditions in the country.

**Significance of accelerators:** Be it a new-born baby or a new-born business, survival depends largely on its adaptability with the environment. An accelerator programme not only provides a healthy environment to a business but also improves its immunity against market shocks, threats and challenges. After joining an accelerator programme, a start-up receives support and guidance of industry experts in all aspects to run the business, successfully and efficiently. Moreover, their relations with venture capitalists help them to meet both short and long-term financial needs. And, the vast and pragmatic knowledge of mentors enable them to overcome the entry barriers that almost every business usually comes across in the initial phase of the journey. Hence, from ecosystem support to funding and polishing the professional skills of the founding members to building image among all the stakeholders, a start-up gains a lot during the accelerator programme.

# Saffronisation of a nation

The Congress is up against a nasty adversary. Playing within the BJP's comfort zone will be like trying to defeat Nadal on red clay. It must force its rival to a surface where the ball skids faster

I must admit to being gobsmacked when the election results gathered momentum and the inevitable stared me in the face. Disappointment would be a severe understatement, I was completely devastated. The numbers seemed unreal, fictitious, as the BJP counter clocked above 300 while that of the Congress party plateaued around 50. A historic mandate, screamed one channel; an unprecedented landslide, suggested another. For once, their egregious hyperbole was not misplaced. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had made a triumphant return, and in fact, bettered his previous performance of 2014 of 282 seats. I say Modi's victory and not that of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) or the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) that he represents because essentially general elections 2019 became like a US presidential contest, where a personality-centric pitch overwhelmed compelling issues that most thought would be the determining factors affecting voter sentiment. That was not to be. There are reports that many voters did not even know the name of the Lok Sabha candidate they were voting for; just the lotus symbol on the EVM machine was sufficient motivation. Not unexpectedly, Congress was facing the predictable onslaught of acerbic scrutiny marinated with dollops of unrestrained sarcasm; is the party now facing an irreversible terminal decline? Did NYAY (the Minimum Income Guarantee scheme) fail to percolate down to the last mile? Was the campaign strategy flawed? Was the Congress party unable to answer Modi's rhetorical fusillade of the Grand Old Party being soft on terror? Some partially saffronised TV anchors could barely conceal their *schadenfreude* when mocking the Congress president Rahul Gandhi's leadership. For many of us, it was a dark dismal nightmare. We have seen it before in 2014. But this one hurt a lot more.

The BJP has indulged in asymmetrical warfare with a bountiful treasury, chaperoned by a captivated mainstream media and backed by rent-seeking corporate behemoths who are opportunistic accessories with big ticket deals to formalise. The traditional template of political contestations stood completely upended by the time the victor was formally announced. So where does the Congress party go from not aggregating even 100 Lok Sabha seats in two consecutive elections, while up against a formidable monstrosity that has made winning elections its *raison d'être*? To understand that, first we need to know what really happened.

Modi and BJP president Amit Shah had clearly recognised the clear and present danger following the Congress party wins in the State elections of Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan in December 2018. This electoral adversity followed the sledgehammer blow in Karnataka when the Congress-Janata Dal (Secular) formed the government, by checkmating the BJP's Chanakya. Rahul Gandhi was seeing stratospheric traction on social media, and his relentless assault on Modi on the Rafale corruption scandal, had created a popular leitmotif of *Chowkidar Chor Hai*. Frequent interactions with different sections of people without a pre-arranged script, impromptu press conferences and a refreshingly honest politician, who talked compassionate politics, had the toxic BJP nonplussed. Despite a prodigiously jaundiced media that was sand-bagging Modi, the percep-

tion battle had now become a competitive one. And Modi was feeling the cracks. The farming community was facing diminishing incomes due to falling procurement and lower prices while Modi dilly-dallied on Minimum Support Prices. The agrarian crisis is an alarming reality and a pandemic problem. India's storied demographic dividend has become an onerous liability, as we are confronted with an epic catastrophe on job creation. The macro-economic fundamentals are a manifestation of an economy in virtual stagnation. Demonetisation, which was nothing but an atrocious hocus-pocus economics and the clumsy execution of Goods and Services Tax (GST) had plundered the informal economy, pauperising millions in its wake. India's GDP appears manipulated and government data when unpalatable to Modi (like the job numbers) have been unceremoniously dumped. The latest figures on the automobile industry sales show a conspicuous downward trend and the manufacturing sector appears to be in *rigor-mortis*. The stressed assets in the banking sector are kissing some dark clouds. Sum and substance, a rejuvenated and resolute Rahul Gandhi and a faltering economy had Modi outwitted, foxed. Then Pulwama happened.

For a man who sold the "development" spiel in 2014, Modi calculatedly dumped his flaky past promises which have been nothing but embarrassing snafus such as 2 crore jobs per annum, the obliteration of black money, doubling of farm incomes and creation of monochromatic smart cities, among a few. Post the terror attack at Pulwama and the Balakot trumpet-strike, Modi had found his 2019 trumpcard; muscular nationalism. This became for him what the Kargil war was for former PM Atal Behari Vajpayee. For heart-stopping capture of Wing Commander Abhinandan and his subsequent release by Pakistan were seized by Modi as his own superman prowess

that intimidated Islamabad. *Ghar Me Ghus Ghus Ke Maroonga* (I will enter each and every home and kill them all) was his thundering pomposity that sought to resurrect his attenuated 56" machismo. People whistled and clapped like they once did watching Amitabh Bachchan bash up goons in *Deewaar*. The new global authoritarian leader is now an elected autocrat who presides over an illiberal democracy. For him the most marketable weapon is fear; Islamophobia is popular political currency. An enemy at the border is usually enough. Modi found one at home too. His speech at Wardha, Maharashtra, lambasted Rahul Gandhi for contesting from Wayanad in Kerala because it was a Hindu-minority parliamentary constituency. This was scare-mongering and an "othering" of the fellow Indian. A Prime Minister takes an oath on India's Constitution to embody its consecrated principles in his impartial political conduct; Modi cast them aside, making his preferred religious choice publicly known. It was dog-whistle politics. As the votes closed in on May 23, it was clear Modi's stratagem worked. And how.

In 2014, there were large billboards in Marine Drive, Mumbai that had Modi vaingloriously promoted as a Hindu Holiday Samrat. This time the BJP chose another Hindutva icon, Sadhvi Pragya Singh Thakur. The political messaging behind the questionable choice was unambiguous; even a terror-accused allegedly responsible for a bomb blast that killed six persons in Malegaon and injured several from the minority community was kosher. Modi was legitimising an orchestrated violent attack, even proposing to give the controversial candidate a haloed seat in the Parliament. It was an abject low even by BJP's polarising standards. But there it was. For Thakur, Mahatma Gandhi's assassin Nathuram Godse was a patriot. Thakur's electoral victory from Bhopal on May 23 is perhaps the defining moment of this

election, and of the reshaping of India. The Congress party will have to aggressively defend the Indian Constitution, which is being systematically annihilated by ridiculing its quintessential credo. It is an ideological war where BJP's Hindutva enterprise cleverly disguised through cultural nationalism is getting fresh tailwinds. First, the BJP trivialised communal harmony by creating the term pseudo-secular, and now the Indian liberal is called an Urban Naxal. The Saffron Project is to gradually infiltrate institutions and convert impressionable Indians through religious chauvinism. The Congress faces an arduous challenge given BJP's propaganda machine, social media troll army and the WhatsApp fake news manufacturing capabilities. The party is up against a nasty adversary that has altered the rules of the game. Playing within the BJP's comfort zone will be like trying to defeat Rafael Nadal on red clay at the French Open. There is only one option; force your opponent to a surface where the ball skids faster and the grass is green.

The Congress party will have to reinvent the political discourse, while simultaneously maximising its enormous human talent currently performing at low productivity on account of bureaucratic cholesterol in its organisational structure. Internal disorganisation is costing the party dear, as was expressed by the Congress president himself. There is tremendous energy that needs to be liberated for the great struggle ahead. It is time to take bold pragmatic risks, be unpredictable and practise political plasticity. There is too much at stake. It is a battle that must be won.

Rahul Gandhi correctly said that the 2019 election was a battle for India's soul. That soul is today splintered into smithereens. But the soul is indestructible. And it will find its voice again.

## In search of a mythical river

The Saraswati might have been a myth for some but satellite imagery clearly shows that such a river system did exist in line with present-day Ghaggar and had a very wide basin right up to the Rann of Kutch. It was linked to the Sutlej

River valleys over the centuries have cradled and nurtured some famous civilisations. For obvious reasons, this pattern has continued and even today most of the large cities continue to flourish on the river banks. Excavations and discoveries undertaken by Sir Mortimer Wheeler during the earlier decades of the last century unravelled the secrets of the Indus Valley civilisation hitherto lying buried under centuries of history.

We may have known about the Indus Valley civilisation much earlier had the original discoveries by Charles Mason, a noted archaeologist in the 1820s, been given more serious consideration. It may come as a surprise but some of the Harappan sites

around the Indus are known to have been pillaged by contractors for brick ballast to build a portion of the Lahore railway in the later half of the nineteenth century.

Archaeological evidence shows that Indus was highly prone to floods and frequent changes of course. As the sister river to the Indus, the Mihran also carried large volumes of water along a course parallel and eastwards of Indus. But over the millennia, the Mihran has ceased to exist, so also the towns on its banks. In later studies, the Mihran came to be identified with Hakra as well as the Saraswati (also extinct).

Recent (May 2019) excavations reported from Ganweriwala indicate the town to have been located on the banks of old river Hakra, often cited as the mythical Saraswati. There has been a renewed interest in the recent years in river Saraswati, as the department of culture has initiated a project for research on satellite imagery to ascertain and chart out the entire route of this ancient river. It would be in the general area of the present states

of Haryana and Rajasthan that evidence would be attempted to be collected to ascertain whether the civilisation around the Saraswati was an extension of the Indus valley or vice versa.

The mythical Saraswati River, which is now extinct, has found wide mention in the Puranas and ancient Indian history. The *Skanda Purana* mentions that the Kanyakubja Mahadesh of Bhoja, comprising 36 lakh villages, extended up to Kurukshetra and Saraswati. In the Rigveda, a river course has been mentioned, which now corresponds to the Saraswati and Ghaggar. The Saraswati has been mentioned as a mighty river from the pre-Vedic times. By the time the *Manusmriti* and the *Mahabharata* came to be written, it had already developed its present character. Manu calls the place where it disappears as Vinasana. The *Mahabharata* states that after disappearing, the river reappeared at three places. It disappears in sands near the village of Chalur and reappears at Bhavanipur. At Ballachapart, it again disappears,



only to appear again at Barakhera. At Urnai, near Pehova, (ancient Prithudaka), it is joined by the Markanda stream. At Sirsa (ancient Sairishka), it is joined by Drishavadi or Chitang. The area between the Saraswati and Drishavadi is known to be the sacred land of Brahmavarta, the home of the Vedic *rishis*. After disappearing, the dry bed reappears south of Rohri and runs parallel to the Indus into the Arabian Sea, which is anal-

ogous to the ancient Mihran Hakra System. The other cities of the Saraswati era were Kapishtala (Kaithal), Sonaprastha or Sonapat and Paniyaprastha or Panipat.

Reports of the appearance of sweet water in certain dry areas of Kutch after the earthquake also led to a revival of interest in the archaeology of the Indus Valley and the impact of tectonic movements on the river systems. It is widely believed that the Saraswati river system may have become dry on account of one such upheaval. There is sufficient data to show that the original course of the Sutlej was to follow a southward flow from Ropar (Punjab) towards the Ghaggar, the two coming together near Shatrana in Sangrur district and then flowing towards Kutch. The sharp bend and a directional change at Ropar, which is extremely unusual considering the flat terrain, may appear to have been possible on account of a tectonic uplift. This may have led to the ultimate drying up of the Ghaggar-Saraswati system as Sutlej was the only perennial source

of water in the area, which may have changed course due to an earthquake.

That the Sutlej was earlier joined to the Ghaggar-Saraswati system is also borne out from a legend in the *Mahabharata*, where it is mentioned that Vashistha threw himself into the Sutlej to commit suicide. The Saraswati might have been a myth for some but satellite imagery clearly shows that such a river system did exist in line with the present day Ghaggar, and had a very wide basin right up to the Rann of Kutch.

Another interesting feature of the ancient history of this area is the speculation on the possible linkage between the Harappan civilisation and the Gangetic plain. Is it that the river Saraswati could provide the missing link? Only forthcoming research would be able to decipher this centuries-old secret whether Saraswati was originally joined by Sutlej or by river Yamuna, both these rivers having changed course centuries ago.

# Investors' wealth rises by ₹3.86 lakh crore

Investors' wealth has gone up by ₹3.86 lakh crore in two days of market rise where the Sensex has gained 872 points after the decisive mandate for the BJP in the general election.

The 30-share BSE key index has gained 871.9 points in two days. The Sensex Monday closed 248.57 points higher at 39,683.29.

Led by the rally in the equity market, the market capitalisation (m-cap) of BSE-listed companies rose by ₹3,86,220.41 crore to ₹1,54,11,395.90 crore on the BSE.

At the close of trade on Thursday, the market valuation of BSE-listed firms was ₹1,50,25,175.49 crore.

The Sensex had hit its all-time high of 40,124.96 during the trade on May 23, the day election results were announced.

Hemang Jani, Head (Advisory), Sharekhan by BNP Paribas said, "Indian markets end the day on a positive note. The markets continue their upward trend supported by FII (foreign institutional investor) buying in the past two consecutive trading days. The current government winning the general elections by a two-thirds of majority will claim the political environment in the country."

He said slowdown in global growth, US-China trade war along with rise in oil prices pose an immediate threat to domestic markets

"However, post the elections, we now expect the market to revert to fundamental issues such as earnings growth," Jani added.

From the 30-share pack, 17 scrips gained led by Tata Steel, YES Bank, NTPC, Larsen and Toubro, Axis Bank and State Bank of India.

Among sectoral indices, the BSE capital goods, power, industrials, utilities, metal and realty indices rallied up to 3.06 per cent.

In the broader market, the S&P BSE Midcap index gained 1.13 per cent and BSE Smallcap 1.77 per cent.

On the BSE, 1,793 scrips advanced, while 785 declined and 188 remained unchanged.

# India Inc revenue growth in Q4 hits six-quarter low of 10.7%

Weakness in consumer spending and softening commodity prices have led India Inc to deliver a six-quarter low revenue growth of 10.7 per cent for January-March period, a report said Monday.

From profitability perspective, operating margins also narrowed 0.78 per cent to 16.8 per cent during the period, but were up 0.93 per cent on lower commodity prices and price hikes, rating agency Icria said in the report.

The agency analysed the results of 304 listed entities while arriving at the aggregate.

It said for the consumer companies, the revenue growth declined to 2.3 per cent for March quarter, 2018-19, down from 9.8 per cent in the preceding quarter, while the same for companies in the commodity-linked sectors was 12.4 per cent as compared to 31 per cent.

The weakness in the consumer-linked sectors was visible in the decline in wholesale dispatches of passenger vehicles and two-wheelers and sequential decline in same store sales growth of quick service restaurants, retail chains and FMCG companies, its Vice President Shamsher Dewan said.

# Trump says US not ready for China trade deal

President Donald Trump says the US isn't ready to make a trade deal with China, but he's leaving open the possibility that the two nations could strike an agreement someday.

Speaking in Tokyo Monday, Trump said of China, "they would like to make a deal. We're not ready to make a deal."

He added, "We're taking in tens of millions of dollars of tariffs and that number could go up very, very substantially, very easily."

Still, Trump predicted a "very good deal with China sometime into the future because I don't believe that China can continue to pay these really hundreds of billions of dollars in tariffs."

The world's two largest economies are in a tense standoff over trade, Trump has said he expected to meet with his



Chinese counterpart, Xi Jinping, next month at a G-20 meeting in Japan.

Trump said he knows that his advisers think that North Korea violated UN Security Council resolutions when it fired off short-range missiles earlier this month. But Trump said he sees it differently — and that it doesn't matter anyway.

Trump said perhaps North Korean leader Kim Jong Un was trying to get attention with the tests.

Trump spoke Monday in Tokyo alongside Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, who also believes North Korea's recent tests violated UN resolutions.

# Reliance to sell BIG FM to Music Broadcast for ₹1,200 crore

Anil Ambani's Reliance Group will sell its FM radio business by divesting its entire stake in BIG FM Radio to Jagran Prakashan-owned Music Broadcast Ltd (MBL) for an estimated value of ₹1,200 crore, an official statement Monday said.

Reliance Capital and Reliance Land (a part of Reliance Capital Group) will divest their entire equity stake in Reliance Broadcast Network Ltd (RBNL) to Music Broadcast Ltd (MBL).

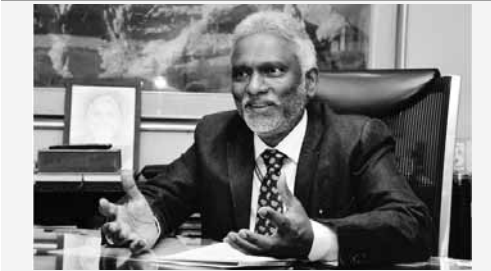
The move would help in reducing the loan burden of the Reliance group firms, it added.

"This transaction is part of our overall strategy to reduce exposure in non-core businesses and will reduce our debt by an estimated ₹1,200 crore," the statement Reliance Capital CFO Amit Bapna said in a statement.

RBNL operates under the brand name BIG FM Radio network with 58 stations across the country. MBL will initially acquire a 24 per cent equity stake of RBNL by way of a preferential allotment for ₹202 crore.

Thereafter, subject to the receipt of all regulatory approvals, MBL will acquire all of the remaining equity stake held by Reliance Capital and Reliance Land in RBNL at a total enterprise value of ₹1,050 crore.

# AI adoption to raise productivity by over 2 times in India by 2021: Microsoft

Adoption of artificial intelligence is expected to help double the rate of industrial innovation, and may result in over two times jump in employee productivity in India by 2021, a study by tech giant Microsoft said Monday.

The study, conducted by research firm IDC on behalf of Microsoft, said organisations

that have adopted AI saw tangible improvements in the range of 8-22 per cent in areas like customer engagement, margins and competitiveness.

"By 2021, artificial intelligence (AI) will more than double the rate of innovation at organisations (2.2 times) and employee productivity (2.3 times) in India," the study titled 'Future Ready Business: Assessing Asia Pacific's Growth Potential Through AI' said.

However, only one-third of the organisations (respondents) in India said they have embarked on their AI journeys. The study found that India business leaders and workers hold positive viewpoints about the AI's impact on the future of jobs.

About 64 per cent of business leaders and 63 per cent of workers believe that AI will either help to do their existing jobs better or reduce repetitive tasks.

When it comes to creating or replacing jobs, 16 per cent of business leaders believe that AI will create new jobs, but 18 per cent also feel that the technology will replace workers.

The report said that about 85 per cent of businesses pri-

oritise skilling and re-skilling of workers in the future and plan to invest in the human capital even or even more compared to investing in technology.

"Economies and businesses that have yet to embark on their AI journey run a real risk of missing out on the competitive benefits that are enjoyed by leaders. Businesses must now embrace a new culture, where innovation and continuous learning are core components of the organisational culture," Microsoft India National Technology Officer Rohini Srivastha told reporters here.

The Asia Pacific study was based on response from 1,605 business leaders and 1,585 workers, including 200 business leaders and 202 workers in India. Fifteen countries were part of the report including Australia, China, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, and Singapore among others.

# BHEL's Q4 Net Profit up by 50.7%

# India's crude steel output almost flat at 8.662 MT in April

India's crude steel output remained almost flat at 8.662 million tonne (MT) during April 2019, according to official data.

The domestic crude steel production stood at 8.653 MT during April 2018, according to a report by the Joint Plant Committee (JPC), which comes under the Ministry of Steel.

"Crude steel production stood at 8.662 MT in April 2019, up by 0.1 per cent over April 2018," the report said. State-run Steel Authority of India Ltd, Rashtriya Ispat

Nigam Ltd along with private firms Tata Steel, Essar Steel, JSW Steel, and Jindal Steel and Power produced 5.082 MT and the remaining 3.58 MT came from other producers, it added. During April this year, the production of hot metal was 1.4 per cent down at 5.825 MT, against 5.907 MT in April 2018.

The output of pig iron grew 3.9 per cent to 0.537 MT in April, compared with about 0.517 MT in the same month a year ago.

The JPC is the only institution in the country that collects data on the domestic iron and steel sector.

# ComMin releases draft compendium of export policy

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

The Commerce Ministry has come out with a comprehensive draft of the export policy which includes product specific rules with a view to provide a ready reckoner for exporters.

Based on inputs received from various partner government agencies, it is proposed to bring out a comprehensive exports policy for all ITC (HS) tariff codes (including items which are 'free' for export and do not currently exist in the policy), covering conditions/restrictions imposed by partner government agencies on exports," the Directorate General of Foreign Trade said. The draft policy aims at consolidating the export norms for each product as applicable at different Government agencies.

ITC-HS Codes are Indian Trade Classification based on Harmonized System of Coding. It was adopted by India for import-export operations. Every product has been accorded eight digit HS codes.

The compendium will help an exporter know all the applicable norms pertaining to a particular product, helping him/her understand policy conditions for that item.

The silent enemy

Fatty liver disease has emerged as a public health problem in India. We are referring to fatty liver that develops in people who take little or no alcohol. It is called as Non-alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease (NAFLD). The disease is characterised by increased deposition of fat (triglycerides) in the liver. Nearly one in three adults in India has NAFLD. It is strongly associated with obesity, especially central obesity (pot-belly or increased waist circumference), and Diabetes.

Fatty liver disease behaves like any other chronic liver disease in the long run. In about one-third of patients with fatty liver, the disease progresses to cirrhosis (fibrosed or hard liver), end-stage liver disease (liver failure) and even liver cancer. This is especially for people who have Diabetes, abnormal liver function test as tested in the blood or increased fibrosis as measured by Fibroscan. Fatty liver not only increases the chances of liver disease and liver-related death but also increases the risk of heart attack, stroke, high blood pressure and certain cancers of the gut.

There are multiple metabolic mechanisms that lead to development of fatty liver. Insulin resistance is at the core of these metabolic pathways. All Indians are genetically susceptible to acquiring insulin resistance and developing fatty liver. Certain risk factors are strongly associated with NAFLD. These are obesity (BMI more than 25 kg/m2), central obesity (waist circumference more than 90 cm in men and more than 80 cm in women) and Diabetes. Increasing age (more than 40 years), male gender and increased liver enzymes are also known risk factors of the disease.

What to do if one is diagnosed with NAFLD?

An ultrasound of the abdomen is done for some diseases or as a health check-up that picks up fatty liver. In some situations, abnormal liver function test (LFT) leads to the diagnosis. One must consult a Gastroenterologist for further evaluation and advice. Certain tests will be done to assess the injury to the liver and severity of the disease, namely, LFT, viral markers and Fibroscan (quantifies the fat in liver and the extent of fibrosis). Presence of Diabetes, hypertension, dyslipidemia (high cholesterol/triglycerides) also needs to be checked. Other causes of fatty liver like alcohol, drugs, alternative medicine needs to be ruled out.

**Treatment:** There is no proven drug therapy for fatty liver disease. The only proven measure is weight loss and life style modifications. Eating small portions of meals (hypocaloric diet), less fried food and fast food, less sugar intake and no alcohol. Regular moderate intensity exercise like brisk walk, jogging, cycling, swimming and other such similar activities are strongly recommended. High Intensity Interval Training (HIIT) and resistance training are particularly beneficial for dissolving excess fat in the body.

Drugs are used if lifestyle modification fails or there is significant fibrosis in liver as measured by Fibroscan. Drugs that have some benefit in reversing fatty liver are Vitamin E in non-Diabetics and Pioglitazone or Liraglutide in Diabetics. Atorvastatin and omega-3 fatty acids have also been tried on such patients.

**Prevention:** Maintaining an ideal body weight as per age and height is the best way to prevent fatty liver. Judicious eating, regular exercise, avoiding high sugar and alcohol intake are of immense help in avoiding fatty liver. Periodic health check ups for liver health are recommended.

Modifying lifestyle to include judicious hypocaloric diet and regular exercise not only prevents but is also the only proven therapy for fatty liver disease.

Neuro Linguistic Programming is helping people fight mental and physical disorders. PRAPTI JAIN tells you how

The human brain and how it functions is perhaps the most fascinating of all. But once it is traumatised, it becomes difficult to bring it out from that phase. The recent development in the field of counselling is Neuro Linguistic Programming (NLP) comes to the rescue today.

"The NLP, as the name suggests, is a way to communicate with the brain, both verbally as well as physically. Most of the time, the pains and issues that you face are actually an effect of your memories and belief systems. Through NLP we help to cure them all" says master practitioner Yogesh Verma who has been using this technique for last few years to transform himself and others.

With an alarming increase in a number of mental disorders, NLP is one of the most effective techniques to handle them. Some of the mental problems that NLP can resolve are stress issues, stage fright, nervousness, anxiety, fear, phobia, heavy mood swings or depression, suicidal tendencies, stammering and extreme psychological problems like bipolar disorders, autism and OCD. The NLP even holds the capacity to cure physical problems like cancer, thyroid and others.

"The NLP works all the way through your mind (mainly subconscious), belief system and representative system," Shilpi Verma another master practitioner tells you.

"A memory or a bad memory which leaves behind an impact in the form of phobia, disease or any disorder is just the way how your mind has internally represented it to you. For example when a person drowns once, maybe during childhood or any phase of his life, then they fear going back into the water, or if the person is a swimmer, then they lose the confidence and panics in swimming pools. It happens just because of how the thought or the

Sometimes, memories are the worst form of torture. Quoting Dr John Grinder, the founder of NLP, Verma said: "The NLP is all about trial and error." When a case comes to them, they never judge as to how they could resolve the issue. They just go to the core of the problem and understand where the issue lies."

he tells you that when he and his wife (Shilpi) counsel their clients, the content is never important to them, instead, the thing that affects the client the most is how that thought has been organised in his mind. That is why there is a reason for your different attitude and behaviour and why people react differently in the same situation or why you procrastinate even when you know that you have no time to procrastinate. There is a reason why people are never calm during work or project presentations or why you have food cravings. All the reasons have only one answer: different representative systems and belief systems. By understanding your representative system, you can even decode the reason behind your actions and reactions," Verma explains

He recalls how he came to know about NLP. "I was at Hindustan Aeronautics Limited when I came to know about it. Back then, some trainers used to visit us for the relaxation sessions. There I came to know about NLP and noticed some internal changes within me. I was more active and charged up, both physically and mentally. I got emotionally stable. I was able to achieve my goals more easily. My mind was learning more and more skills every day with more efficiency," he tells you.

After learning about NLP and having attending courses, he changed his professional line from being in HAL to being a Master in NLP. "The trainers who trained us at HAL said that I had the potential to transform lives and help people out from their hardships. They offered me to join their course. They said that I can take it as a part-time job or an adventure as I was

wanted to quit because they showed me the mirror to my true self which I didn't want to see. It felt like, I never knew myself. The thing I thought about myself was all turning out to be fake — a mirage. In those five days, I started working on that internal Shilpi whom I came into terms with on the first day. I can say that from that day onwards, my journey of NLP started," she tells you and adds that afterwards she enrolled herself for the practitioner course from various different places and went for the masters course along with more different courses.

Verma shares how the founders of NLP stumbled upon the programme. "They studied the methods of the world's top therapists, executives and anthropologists and came up with NLP. It is the study of excellent communication — both with your own self and with others. NLP is not just a set of tools and techniques, it is so much more than that. It is an attitude and a methodology of knowing how to achieve your goals and get results. It is the art and science of excellence and transformation, derived from studying how experts in different fields obtain their success," Verma tells you.

The NLP, according to Verma, makes you actualise your potential. You are able to achieve what you really wanted to achieve. "In reality you never know your potential. You just build your beliefs thinking that you won't be able to achieve anything higher or more than what you have. But, once you push your limits, you realise that you have been underestimating yourself. This is one of the ways how NLP helps you achieve your goals and be successful in your lives," he says and tell you that these skills should be learned by everyone for self-development and to improve their effectiveness both personally and professionally.

When you brought your baby from home he was sweet and well-behaved. Then suddenly a couple of weeks later, the angel started crying and screaming at the top of its head. Dealing with a colicky baby can be frustrating but there are many simple things you can try to soothe the baby.

First, wrap the baby in a blanket of a cloth properly. Reduce loud sounds and bright lights. Rock your baby massage them to calm them. Sucking can help relieve stress and calm the babies. Try and give your baby a pacifier.

Giving the baby a warm bath can be a good remedy for. Fill the bathtub with some warm water. While your baby lies in the bath gently massage the abdomen to help relieve any gas.

Another great method is to give a warm compress. Dip a towel in warm water and squeeze out the excess water. Place the cloth on baby's tummy; you can also gently rub the tummy.

Help your baby pass gas. Place the baby on his back. Hold the knees together and gently push the legs back towards the tummy. Hold the legs this way for a few seconds. You can do this exercise even while massaging the baby.

PS: Don't force this exercise if the baby offers resistance.

Indian oncologists are increasingly battling unscientific miracle treatments for cancer shared widely on social media. Recently, Mumbai's Tata Memorial Centre (TMC), the country's premier cancer institute, issued a rebuttal on a strange cancer remedy attributed to them in a widely circulated WhatsApp message. The message stated that hot coconut water can destroy cancer cells of all types.

Often, many irrelevant and widely circulated unscientific remedies defer treatment for diseases in patients. There is a need to raise awareness on the fact that people should not be influenced by such false claims and miracle remedies on social media.

Dr KK Aggarwal, President, Heart Care Foundation of India, said: "It is the ability to anticipate, recognise and the quickness shown in managing any com-

plication that marks a distinguishing characteristic of a 'good' doctor and sets him apart from others. To acquire these clinical and procedural skills, a doctor undergoes years of rigorous study and training. Only then do they acquire adequate knowledge, discernment and develop skills to take the right decision for the patient and adapt to changing practices."

However, today, people on social media, 'cure-mongers', 'quacks' and 'diet gurus' issue medical diktats and people are inclined to be attracted to alternative and unscientific treatments. These leave some confused and others undertake these measures believing in them. From hoax and fake news on chronic diseases like Diabetes to the miracle remedies that offer cure for these, there is a plethora of news on social media that can be dangerous.

Feeling stressed out? Take this newly discovered home-test that can easily measure your stress level and tell you whether you need to consult a doctor or not.

The researchers, including one of Indian origin, from the University of Cincinnati have conducted a new test with a device that uses ultra-violet light to measure common stress hormones using sweat, blood, urine or saliva. "This may not give you all the information, but it tells you whether you

need a professional who can take over," said Andrew Steckl, Professor at the varsity.

The research, published in *American Chemical Society Sensors* journal, showed that the device measures stress biomarkers in our blood, sweat, urine or saliva. Stress is linked to several physical ailments like Diabetes, high BP and neurological or psychological disorders. Understanding how stress affects you individually could be extremely valuable, the researchers said.

talks about the health benefits of gluten-free diet and whether it helps in weight reduction



There is a sudden surge of gluten-free diet, almost everywhere. The Internet is flooded with information on gluten-free diet and many famous personalities are endorsing this kind of diet. But, is it worth the hype?

Gluten is a storage protein found in grains like wheat, rye, split, and barley. Wheat is regarded as the most widely consumed grain containing gluten. Gluten gives an elastic texture to the dough, making it easy to knead. Two types of protein varieties found in gluten are glutenin and gliadin, and gliadin is responsible for majority of adverse effects.

Gluten-free was coined in the year of 2013 by United States Foods and Drug Administration for the purpose of food labelling. Gluten-free has been touted as an effective way to lose weight through diet, but such claims are critically flawed. There are certain group of population that should strictly avoid consuming grain containing gluten because of its adverse health effects. This includes people with celiac disease, gluten sensitivity, and wheat allergy. People with these diseases have an immune reaction triggered adversely by gluten. There are certain symptoms that are experienced because of gluten intolerance, these include diarrhoea, abdominal pain, abdominal cramps, bloating, itchy rash and delay of growth in children. There are further health consequences like weight loss, fatigue, anaemia, and certain symptoms of depression. This is because gluten can trigger the immune system making antibodies attack the tiny projections in the intestine that are responsible for absorption of vital nutrients as the food passes by.

Going gluten free is a practical and logical alternative for those suffering from the allergic reactions to gluten. But, the hype surrounding its claims for weight loss do not have a strong scientific backing. Some people benefit with weight loss going gluten free as they tend to avoid processed foods altogether, so the diet becomes more balanced and nutritious.

There is a myth that consuming gluten can lead to weight loss, but the truth is only 1-2% of population really need to avoid gluten because of underlying medical conditions. Weight loss is a matter of creating calorie deficit meaning there should be a deficit between the amount of calories consumed and the amount of calories burned, and this is not dependent on the consumption of gluten. Gluten-free products have been advertised like one stop solution for weight loss but the truth is a well-balanced diet can lead to a healthy weight management. In addition, gluten-free products can sometimes be an expensive and fancy way to burn holes in your pocket. Always remember that 'gluten-free' doesn't mean 'low calorie'.

It should also be taken into consideration that many people self-diagnose or self-declare their gluten sensitivity mostly in the name of fad. But, there are medical protocols to find out whether you are gluten allergic or not. There are blood tests involving antibodies called IgA/ IgE test or a biopsy from the small intestine to diagnose the condition of gluten allergy. If you notice any discomforting symptoms after the consumption of gluten laden foods, always consult a doctor to get the tests done first followed by the right nutritional advice from a qualified nutritionist.

If you are looking for ways to lose excess fat, just cutting back on gluten may not lead to weight loss. It's all about incorporating a healthy lifestyle and balancing your dietary intake along with managing your stress levels. Do not just fall for any dietary fad circulating around with non-scientific claims.

Women should avoid eating too much vegetable

oil and potato chips during pregnancy as such a diet may result in an increased risk of pregnancy complications and poor development of the babies, warns a study.

Foods such as potato chips and vegetable oil contain omega 6 fats, particularly linoleic acid, and the research suggests that overconsumption of this nutrient can promote inflammation and may be associated with an increased risk of heart disease.

The finding, published in *The Journal of Physiology*, found that eating a diet with three times the recommended daily intake of linoleic acid might be harmful in pregnancy. For the study, the researchers picked rats for the experiment and they found three changes in rat mothers who ate a high linoleic acid diet: Their liver had altered concentrations of inflammatory proteins, their circulating concentrations of a protein that can cause contraction of the uterus during pregnancy were increased, and a hormone that can regulate growth and development was decreased.

If the effects of high linoleic acid are the same in rats and humans, this would suggest that women of child-bearing age should consider reducing the amount of linoleic acid in their diet.

During the study, the research team fed rats for 10 weeks on a diet with high linoleic acid, mated them and then investigated the effects of the diet on their pregnancy and developing babies.

# Liberal, Green gains upset EU Parl power balance

Liberal and Green say they have broken the two centrist blocs' grip on power in the European Parliament based on a projected shift in the electoral fortunes of the four.

Liberal and Green are now pushing harder to snag the head of the European Commission, the 28-nation EU executive, and shape key laws, such as on climate change and taxation.

The centre-right EPP (European People's Party) still has the most seats, followed by the centre-left Socialists, but the pair no longer control a majority, according to partial and projected results.

"The monopoly of power is broken," said Margrethe

Vestager, whose Alliance of Liberals and Democrats (ALDE) wants her to head the new commission.

ALDE is projected to have around 100 seats, making it third in the assembly behind some 180 seats for the EPP and 152 for the Socialists and Democrats.

But ALDE and the Greens also hope to work with the EPP and the Socialists to check big gains by Eurosceptics, populist and right-wing parties who could have around 150 seats. Though power is set to be fragmented, the mainstream, pro-European Union groups still control the lion's share of the 751-seat assembly.

Vestager alluded to her own credentials for the top job on the Commission, where

she served as the anti-trust commissioner and gained a reputation for toughness. She said EU voters have broken the EPP and Socialist monopoly the way she stopped US hi-tech firms and other multinationals from under-

Warsaw: Poland's governing right-wing Law and Justice party (PiS) won European elections, complete official results showed on Monday, with its leader Jaroslaw Kaczynski urging a wider victory in the autumn general ballot.

The PiS took 45.38 per cent of the vote to win 27 of Poland's 51 seats in the European Parliament compared with

38.47 per cent and 22 seats for the liberal European Coalition, according to official results.

The progressive Spring party, led by openly gay former MP and mayor Robert Biedron, took 6.06 per cent for three seats while the far-right Confederation group failed to cross the five-per cent threshold required to enter the European Parliament. AFP

Pope sounds racism alarm as EU nationalists win big

Vatican City: Pope Francis warned Monday against a rise of intolerance and racism as far-right nationalists and eurosceptic parties made historic gains in European elections.

"The signs of meanness we see around us heighten our fear of 'the other', the unknown, the marginalised, the foreigner," he said in a message for the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. AFP

## Trump breaks with Abe, says not bothered by N Korea missile tests

President Donald Trump said Monday he is not "personally" bothered by recent short-range missile tests that North Korea conducted this month, breaking with Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, who is hosting the president on four-day state visit full of pageantry.

Standing beside Trump at a news conference after hours of talks, Abe disagreed with the US president, saying the missile tests violated UN Security Council resolutions and were "of great regret."

Abe, who has forged a strong friendship with Trump and agrees with him on many issues, is concerned because the

## Suspect held after Lyon bomb attack that wounded 13

Paris: French police have arrested a suspect following a blast in the city of Lyon that wounded 13 people last week, Interior Minister Christophe Castaner said Monday.

Castaner announced the development on Twitter. A statement later from Paris prosecutors, who handle all terrorism-related cases, said a 24-year-old was arrested in Lyon and has been placed in

custody. Police had launched a large manhunt after a device exploded Friday on a busy pedestrian street in the central city. Regional authorities said the 13 wounded suffered mostly minor injuries.

President Emmanuel Macron called the explosion an "attack" but no group has claimed responsibility for the explosion yet. AP

## Maoist activists arrested in Nepal as nationwide strike disrupts life

Several Maoist activists were arrested in Nepal as a general strike called by an outlawed communist group on Monday disrupted normal life in the country, a day after a series of explosions rocked the capital Kathmandu, killing at least four people. ## Israel agrees for US-mediated talks with Lebanon on sea border

AFP ■ JERUSALEM

Israel's energy minister said on Monday his country had agreed to enter US-mediated talks with Lebanon on maritime borders that would have an impact on offshore oil and gas exploration. Energy Minister Yuval Steinitz said in a statement after meeting US State Department official David Satterfield that Israel agreed to move forward with the talks.

Lebanese officials said last week that Satterfield, the acting assistant secretary for Near Eastern affairs, had informed them that Israel agreed to the negotiations. Israel had not commented at the time. Last year, Lebanon signed its first contract to drill for oil and gas in its waters, including for a block disputed by its southern neighbour Israel, with which it has fought several wars.

## Madagascar votes in latest battle of political feud

Madagascar held parliamentary elections on Monday in what is being seen as the latest round of a bitter feud between President Andry Rajoelina and his longstanding rival Marc Ravalomanana. Beaten to the top job in December, Ravalomanana has been pushing hard in support of candidates of his TIM ("I Love Madagascar") party, determined to secure a victory in his rivalry with President Rajoelina.

The two men have dominated politics since the early 2000s, sometimes cooperating but mostly fighting for advantage and high office.

"These elections will define our future for the next five years," said Rajoelina after voting in the capital Antananarivo.

"The candidates who will be elected MPs have the duty not only to pass laws, but also to represent the aspirations of the people," Ravalomanana also voted in the capital, and he raised allegations of fraud in the presidential election last December.

"People are less enthusiastic to vote because of the fraud that has already been noted in previous elections," he said.

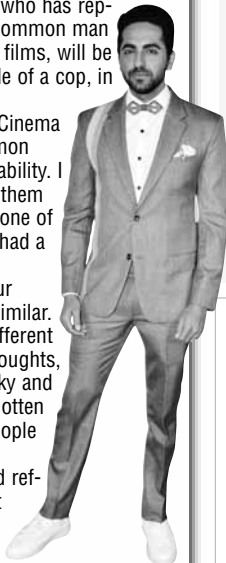

ing to Mumbai. It is actually a very bizarre thing to imagine. But with me, this 'too good to be true' thing did happen and it was surreal," says Lisa as she recalls the time when she first transitioned from her social media videos to singing for mainstream Bollywood.

The self-taught singer from Berhampur (or Brahmapur), Odisha was six when she moved to Chicago and has been living there ever since. However, the love for Indian music just grew. She says, "Composer, Vishal Mishra and Rhea had originally written the song for *Veere Di Wedding*, post which the song was supposed to be a part of the film *Notebook* (which starred Pranav Bahi). And we had been planning it since quite a while about what new element could we add to the song. However, it did turn out to be really good, luckily."

She laughs to add that there was surely an inherent connection between her and the Sonam Kapoor and Kareena Kapoor Khan-starrer film.

Lisa's social media posts are

evidence that the singer has a huge heart for fusion music. She mashes up The Doorbeen's *Lambhergini* and Maroon 5's *Sugar* with such an ease that the two songs look like naturally fitting into each others' beats. She says, "After *Tareefan*, I also sang the rap called *Back to School*. I really like to experiment with different beats and genres of music. And I would like to follow that. And sometimes when you really like two songs from two different genres, why can't you mash them up?"

For the one, who has been practising and following Indian music all her life, how has she seen the music industry in India evolve over the time? "There has been a huge transition since the time I began following Indian music. In the 90s, there were more of melodies and soft tunes. Today, people are much more inclined to good, dance beats. With the changing, fast-paced lifestyles of people, their music

choices, especially of the youngsters, have seen a huge change."

Talking about her various performances for music festivals and concerts across different cities, which are creating waves, she says that those are extremely important, especially for the emerging artists who are able to make their voices heard even more through them. "It is important to get a live audience when it comes to singing because today, with so many advancements and voice modifications through technology, sometimes the authenticity and the originality of an artist is put into question. But performing live, outside of recording studios, is important for people to realise their true voice. No one knows how the song is created inside the recording studio. But the more audience gets to catch you live, the more you get recognition and the enthusiasm to keep performing and giving your best," says she.



Original Veeru dada takes last bow

Bollywood's veteran action director **Veeru Devgn**, father of actor **Ajay Devgn**, passed away, said family sources. He was 85.

Back in the days when technology was not as advanced as today, Veeru choreographed some of the most interesting action sequences for Bollywood, making his actors' and stuntmen's safety top priority.

Remembering Veeru as a responsible director, actress **Madhuri Dixit Nene** said, "He was such a caring action director who used to encourage us, but at the same time was very cautious about our safety. When he choreographed an action scene, he kept the safety in mind. He was such a wonderful human being."

Veeru breathed his last on Monday afternoon at a hospital due to age-related problems, according to a source.

Apart from directing action sequences for films like *Himmatwala*, *Mr India*, *Khatron Ke Khiladi*, *Phool Aur Kaante*, *Dilwale* and *Laal Badshah*, he had directed the 1999 film *Hindustan Ki Kasam*, starring **Ajay** and megastar **Amitabh Bachchan**.

Film fraternity members **Shah Rukh Khan**, **Sanjay Dutt**, **Sunny Deol**, **Bobby Deol**, **Sajid Khan**, **Mahesh Bhatt** and **Harry Baweja** visited the Devgn residence to pay condolences.

Filmmaker **Sanjay Gupta** said he was really "saddened to hear about the demise of Veeru Devgnji."

"I had the honour and pleasure of working with him in my (early) days as an assistant director. He was a fabulous human being and a master technician who always had a smile on his face. May God bless his soul!" he tweeted.

Filmmaker **Anees Bazmee**, who worked with Veeru Devgn in the 1997 film *Sanam*, tweeted, "My heartfelt condolences to **Ajay**, **Kajol** and the family. There will be no better action director than you **Veeruji**. Will miss you!"

# THE TIME IS NOW

Director PRAKHAR GAUTAM tells AYUSHI SHARMA that while talking about sexuality and relationships in the country, we need to look at society as a whole rather than just urban set-ups

In the land where *Kama Sutra* was written, explicit sculptures like the ones at Khajuraho, Ajanta caves and Konark temple prove how sex education and awareness were part of public discourse and sanctified under the hallowed portals of learning at temple complexes. India was not only rich in its heritage and culture but also in its thoughts and mentality which openly accepted nudity in art and public representations of the free spirit beyond the body consciousness. History is evidence of how progressive the mindsets were in the country until a series of invasions led to the alterations in the culture. Of course, things changed further as bigotry of all kinds became a political tool.

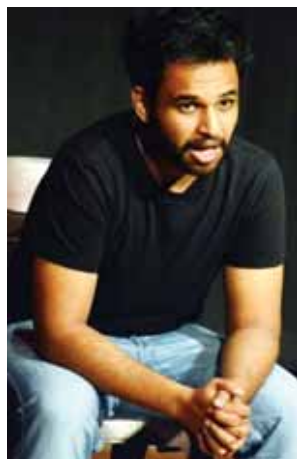
Director Prakhar Gautam's play *Let's Have Sex*, which is a rendition of Russian playwright Valentin Krasnogorov's drama, is based on the dichotomy of a liberated past and a confined present. He says, "I don't know much about the Russian societal norms, but the taboo has been there for so many years in our society. One has to admit that it's a highly patriarchal society. We have certainly evolved but the question is, have we really? The society doesn't just consist of the urban population."

The play is a satire which does not shy away from talking blunt on issues that we sugarcoat with humour or mask in daily interactions. It stays true to its basic objective of taking the taboo off sex and issues on mental health that require dialogue and open conversations relating to patriarchy, sexual performance, sexual violence and masculinity. The director says that sex is just a biological process. "We never talk about it and even if we do it, the connotation becomes funny. People start to giggle or shy away whenever the topic pops up," adds he.

The characters in the play talk and think only about sex. However, renditions of the term differ for each of them. The play gets more complicated and tragic as it gets. But while its characters are driven by the most basic of human emotions — loneliness, their yearning for love, their desire to escape their problems — they poignantly and hilariously never get past discussing, arguing about their favorite subject.

While there have been initiatives to make sex education a part of mainstream curriculum, many people are still reluctant to talk about it openly. For many, it is considered to be an offence to Indian "values." Beyond the metros, there is no acceptance that virginity could indeed be a rare commodity. However, most men are under peer-pressure to lose it and women are under societal pressure to maintain it till the "right" time.

Prakhar says, "If we want to get over with this taboo, we need to start talking more about it. Talking not just within close spaces, but as well in schools and universities. Initially, there will be inertia and resistance, only gradually they will start understanding its importance. Parents must talk about sexual intercourse as a biological process to their children after a certain age. For



instance, when we had learnt how to eat food, even that was a new process for us. We didn't know whether the process was acceptable. We thought that since everyone was doing it, so it was socially acceptable. Same is the case with sex. It's the need of a human body and a natural process, common to all."

Talking about the play, he says that it has been written in a very generic manner, so it is valid everywhere. Prakhar apprises us that there is a very fine line between entertaining or vulgarizing. The essence has to be in the honesty of the actors. "I am a big believer of method acting. I ask the actors to get into the skin of the characters and analyse the subtext and truth of every line the writer has put on paper. If the actor can convince themselves that this isn't vulgar or wrong in anyway or beyond the acceptable lines, it won't even show in their performance. Their

conviction should be natural and that's how it isn't going to look vulgar in any way. The title of the play has been said a lot of times. Never have I ever tried to make it overly seductive, nor tried to exaggerate the lines. It should not look caricaturish. Hence, I have tried to keep its commonality and relatability intact," he says. The director tells us that he is "not" very fond of plays that give a very out-and-out message as they come to talk about social issues but keep harping on them throughout. "There needs to be a story. All the great films, which talk about a social issue, are always backed up with a strong storyline. Just like my play is not an out-and-out satire, it's not talking about this issue. It's a story of five people and how their lives are an analogy to the Indian society."

A jade-hilted dagger once owned by Shah Jahan, creator of the Taj Mahal, a jade cup with an ibex head so realistically carved that the Chinese Emperor Qianlong composed a poem in its honour and a diamond and enamel covered gold *huqqa* pipe, revealing Indian opulence at its best... luxury could never be so lovingly curated. Then there are bejewelled objects, including a gem-set mace set on finial with large Mughal-cut diamonds and an emerald, ruby and diamond set gold pen case and inkwell, a symbol of power at court. Smitten by the description?

You can see (and even buy) all of these artifacts as they are a part of the *Maharajas & Mughal Magnificence* which will be unveiled in a historic sale at Christies New York on June 19. This landmark auction is poised to be the most valuable and precious collection of jewellery and Mughal objects to ever come to auction.

### MAHARAJAS AND MUGHALS

*Maharajas and Mughal Magnificence* puts together an unprecedented group of jewels, gemstones and decorative objects. Consisting of almost 400 lots spanning over 500 years, this auction showcases the illustrious culture of Indian jewelled arts from the Mughal period exploring the creative dialogue between India and the West, to the present day.

The collection begins in Mughal India, under the most important dynasty that ruled the country, famous for its emeralds, diamonds, sapphires, rubies, weapons and objects that are bejeweled beyond belief. It traces the history of jewelry from early Mughal India through the Maharajas and their collaboration with the world's most renowned jewellery houses to create some of the most exceptional pieces of jewelry ever made. ### MUGHAL INDIA

From the regional courts within the Mughal empire, the collection encompasses sensational sarpechs (turban ornaments), necklaces like the diamond riviere originally from the collec-

tion of the Nizam of Hyderabad comprising almost 200 carats of Golconda diamonds and the Nizam of Hyderabad's diamond-encrusted state sword, which illustrates the rich history of bejewelled-ornamentation in India. Also featured are carved Mughal emeralds, ranging in weight from approximately 10 carats to over 200 carats, the famed *Arcot II* diamond, presented to Queen Charlotte, wife of King George III by Muhammad Ali Wallajah Nawab of Arcot, and the magnificent *Mirror of Paradise* which is an internally flawless Golconda diamond of 52.58 carats.

### MAHARAJAS

The Patiala Ruby Choker created by Cartier in 1931 is a superb example of the fusion between India and the West. Commissioned by Maharaja Bhupinder Singh of Patiala, one of Cartier's most important Indian clients of the 1920s and 1930s, he often travelled to Paris with trunks of diamonds and gemstones from his treasury for Cartier's workshops. Another significant example by Cartier is the 'Carved Emerald Brooch', which uses an impressive 19th century hexagonal carved emerald of 380.98 carats. The two-sided carving depicts Lord Rama, his wife Sita, Hanuman, and a poppy blossom on the reverse.

Among more urban tastes, the Enamel and Diamond Peacock Aigrette, by Mellerio dits Meller, was purchased by the Maharaja Jagatjit Singh of Kapurthala in 1905 during one of his trips to Paris. The Maharaja was captivated by the peacock motif of the aigrette, a bird that is still greatly revered in India today. In later years, the aigrette would be worn by Anita Delgado, his fifth wife, whom he met while wearing the jewel on his own turban.

### LANDMARK COLLECTION

Most people associate the Venice Art Biennale with the national pavilions in the Giardini (Biennale gardens) or the main site at the Arsenale — the former dockyards. At the India Pavilion at the former, visitors are swirling around the cane cages of the brilliant artist Shakuntala Kulkarni, and for once the language of the selfie is inclusive of avant garde contemporary Indian art. Utterly feminine, tall bamboo cane ensembles are catching the interest of the visitors for their quaintness.

These artworks belong to her project *Of bodies, armour and cages* (2013-2018) in which historical objects like the armour and the elaborately designed costumes/dresses of different communities are brought together in the contemporary context by re-articulating the usage and the medium. In collapsing and metamorphosing the two, she blurs cultural and visual boundaries.

### CAGED BIRD

When you look at the long-skirted cages and bodies, you can't help but think of Paul Dunbar's famous poem,

*I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings*. In an interview to me in 2013 she said: "For long, I have been making inquiries into body violence, atrocities and experiences of women in different spaces. The impact of these atrocities against women are uncertainty and loss of freedom and power. Women are often blamed for crimes that happen against them; the men are set free and walk around with their heads held high. Morality or norms make a woman lose power."

But she was cautious to state that she didn't want to show women as weak beings. "I never show women as victims," she said emphatically. "They are victimised. They are not completely weak. I show how they fight it out, how they deal with it. My

question is simple: This is how society is. How do I, as a woman, live powerfully?"

### LINEAR AND DELICATE CANE

Shakuntala's sculptures have an Indian insignia. "I used the armour as a metaphor to explore how I could protect my body," states Shakuntala. "I borrowed from all kinds of cultures; Naga masks, Rajasthani ghagra, hair styles from Bollywood in the 1960s — my pieces have no cultural, geographical or religious boundaries. I used cane because I am comfortable with it; also, it is linear, delicate and looks grand. There are rings, bangles, flared skirts and it is very feminine."

As you look through the cane — the ideation seems full of multiple perspectives. The cane is tenuous and tensile, flexible yet delicate in a strong sort of way. No doubt there are many references — history culture and the beauty of dances, Kathakali and Manipuri costumes and regalia become a translation — that are royal yet replete with rhythmic intonations.

### BETWEEN DUALITIES

Her thought process is fascinating. "I wanted to explore what happens when you have a costume as protection... There's a freedom you experience when you're in armour, but at the same time, some part of your body is caught. You're trapped but you're also secure. That to me is interesting."

Visitors at Venice are fascinated by the very structure and the grandeur of the armour which is masculine, stiff, strong, lasting and peerless in nature. The cane figures and heads provoke us to ask questions. The cane armour /costumes in this project speak of the grandeur too. But the elaborately structured dresses look relatively feminine, linear, fragile, and organic in nature, protecting the body, breaking the gaze by the joineries of the pieces of cane and the weave. In more ways than one these cane installations are reflective of 'interesting times' in the words of curator Ralph Rugoff. These sculptures were part of her solo show at Chemould Gallery, Mumbai last year.

# Pak can re-produce 1992 magic: Waqar

Former Pakistan captain and bowling great Waqar Younis feels Sarfraz Ahmed and his boys can pull off an upset this World Cup, much like they did in 1992 by winning the coveted trophy.

"It is 27 years since Pakistan won the World Cup for the first time and this year feels like it did back then," Waqar was quoted as saying by ICC.

"No one gave us a chance and we arrived as the underdog. But the momentum came and we won the whole thing, that is the beauty of Pakistan cricket."

"I was not part of the team because I was injured just before the World Cup, but I remember the team coming home. The whole country was out on the streets, the lights were on and we had a trophy parade."

"It was party-mode, it was a carnival. Hopefully, that will happen again, but there is work



to do," said Waqar who coached Pakistan, besides being credited with the man who really put the reverse into swing bowling.

In 26 ODI's, Waqar has taken 416 wickets while in 87

task for them after that.

"If they don't start well then the negativity from series defeats to England and Australia could seep back in. They have been losing a few games and need to win early so settle nerves."

Since winning the Champions Trophy in 2017, Pakistan have won only two of the seven series they have played. The first of these was against a dismal Sri Lanka side and the second was against Zimbabwe. Three of the series defeats have been whitewashes.

Despite that, Waqar feels if Sarfraz and Co can get their fielding right, they have talent in their arsenal to pull it off.

"The positive for Pakistan is that they have started scoring big totals. They have showed they are capable of scoring 300 plus and we saw that in their series against England."

"The batsman very good used to the surfaces very quickly and have piled on the runs. They are

all in good form, especially Babar Azam and Haris Sohail," he said.

Pakistan lost the series to England 0-4 but managed to put up 300+ totals on three occasions.

Waqar said the top four looks sorted for Pakistan with Fakhar Zaman and Imam-ul-Haq doing well.

"Fakhar Zaman and Imam-ul-Haq have also done well so the top four looks really good. That issue has been solved."

"But the biggest issue for me is the fielding. The fielders looked out of sorts in the series against England and that could shake their confidence."

"I am sure that will get a bit better but if the fielders don't take their chances and catch balls and stop the extra 15 or 20 runs then they could struggle."

Waqar said he looks forward to watching Mohammad Amir in action, adding the overall bowling is headed in the

right direction although they looked all over the place against the mighty English.

"The bowling is moving in a good direction, with Wahab Riaz coming back into the side and Mohammad Amir restored. I am intrigued to see how Mohammad Amir gets on."

"He is a match-winner, there is no doubt about that. If he gets some rhythm back, then he could be the difference for Pakistan."

"On the flip side, Shaheen Afridi and Mohammad Hasnain are so talented and have long futures ahead of them. I am excited to see what they can do."

Pakistan will take on West Indies in their opener on May 31.

"That first game against the West Indies will be vital. It is worth watching that! Both are very exciting teams and very unpredictable, you never know what you are going to get."



# Eng are favourites but India, Aus also serious contenders: McGrath

Australian pace legend Glenn McGrath has handpicked England as the favourites to lift the upcoming World Cup but said going by current form, India and Australia too are serious contenders for the title.

McGrath, who retired from international cricket after winning the Player of the Tournament in Australia's victorious 2007 World Cup, said going by their recent prowess in ODI, Eoin Morgan's men are the ones to beat in the showpiece.

"England, a very good one-day unit. To me they are the favourites going into this World Cup, so I think they'll do very well," McGrath was quoted as saying by ESPNcricinfo.

"Probably! I can't remain biased my whole life. You've got to go on current form. The England team — the way they go about it, they have impressed me. They have scored some big, big totals."

"Most teams used to go hard in the first 15 and the last 15, and consolidate in the middle. But teams like England, India are just going hard the whole 50 overs, and that's the impact T20 cricket has had. So yeah, I don't think I've ever said 'England are the team to beat' or the 'favourites'," he added.

McGrath, however, was of the view that India and Australia have the capability to give England a tough fight.

"I didn't say they (England) were going to win the World Cup though! So they are the favourites and are going to be tough to beat in their own conditions, but fingers crossed, Australia can do well," he said.

"The two standouts to me were India and England, with fingers crossed, Australia doing well."

The former lanky right-arm pacer also picked South Africa, West Indies and Pakistan as the teams to watch out for in the World Cup, but predicted Australia to make the final.

happens after that is for the benefit of the team," Amla was quoted as saying by the ICC website.

The veteran opener wants to make every opportunity count and that was the reason he opted out of a domestic T20 competition's knock-out rounds to prepare for the World Cup.

"T20 is different to fifty-over cricket. I had two weeks with (batting coach) Dale Benkenstein and spent time in the nets batting the way a fifty-over cricketer would bat. It was important to have that time. Sometimes it works out, sometimes it doesn't," said Amla, who needs another 90 to reach 8000 runs in ODIs.



# Nadal, Djokovic cruise through at Roland Garros

Defending champion Rafael Nadal got his bid for a record-extending 12th French Open title off to the perfect start by brushing aside German qualifier Yannick Hanfmann, while world number one Novak Djokovic was also a comfortable victor in the first round at Roland Garros on Monday.

Nadal, a 17-time Grand Slam champion, cruised to a 6-2, 6-1, 6-3 victory on the rebuilt Court Philippe Chatrier to set up a clash with another German qualifier — world number 114 Yannick Maden — in round two.

Nadal had suffered three consecutive semi-final defeats earlier in the clay-court season, but appeared to find his best in an Italian Open title success sealed with victory over old rival Djokovic, while his French Open win-loss record now reads 87-2.

"It's always amazing to play here, the new Chatrier is very nice," the second seed said. "It's been an important place in my career."

"I played a good tournament in Rome which was very important for my confidence. Now we'll see."

Djokovic laid down an early marker in his bid to hold all four Grand Slam titles simultaneously for the second time, powering past Polish youngster Hubert Hurkacz.

The 15-time major champion impressed in a 6-4, 6-2, 6-2 triumph and will face Swiss lucky loser Henri Laaksonen in round two.

"I was very solid. I'm happy with my game today," said the top seed. "It's a long tournament... But I just want to concentrate on my next match."

Twelve months ago, Djokovic dropped out of the world's top 20 after a shock quarter-final loss to Marco Cecchinato and even pondered skipping Wimbledon, but he has instead reclaimed his place at the top of the game.

The 22-year-old Hurkacz, who has claimed three wins over top-10 players this season, had no answer to the 2016 French Open winner, as Djokovic sealed a second-round spot without breaking sweat, hitting 27 winners.

Earlier on Monday, former world number one Caroline Wozniacki collapsed to a 0-6, 6-3, 6-3 loss to Russian world number 68 Veronika Kudermetova in the first round.

The Danish 13th seed had retired injured from her two previous matches in the lead-up to Roland Garros, and fell away badly after a strong first set.

"I think she got very lucky at the start of the second set and took advantage of the opportunities she got," said Wozniacki.

Sixth seed and two-time Wimbledon champion Petra Kvitova was forced to pull out before her scheduled opener against Sorana Cirstea with a left arm injury, but said she should be fit for Wimbledon, which starts on July 1.

"(I'll be out for) two to three weeks, so I'll do some fitness and everything that I can do to prepare my body for the tennis on the grass," said the Czech.

Dutch fourth seed Kiki Bertens looked in fine fettle, though, beating home player Pauline Parmentier 6-3, 6-4.

Elsewhere in the women's draw, Australian eighth seed Ashleigh Barty saw off American Jessica Pegula 6-3, 6-3.

In the men's event, three-time Grand Slam champion Stan Wawrinka progressed with a 6-1, 6-7 (3/7), 6-2, 6-3 win over Slovakian Jozef Kovalik.

Australian Alex De Minaur, seeded 21st, beat the United States' Bradley Klahn 6-1, 6-4, 6-4, although Georgian 15th seed Nikoloz Basilashvili and Russian 12th seed Daniil Medvedev both exited the tournament.

# SPURS UPBEAT ABOUT KANE AHEAD OF CL FINAL

Tottenham Hotspur manager Mauricio Pochettino has said Harry Kane is in a "very positive situation" and could be fit to face Liverpool in Saturday's Champions League final in Madrid.

England forward Kane has been out of action since suffering an ankle injury during the first leg of the quarter-final against Manchester City.

But Pochettino, speaking to reporters on Monday, indicated Kane was close to a



return. "Harry Kane in the last week, Friday and Saturday, started to be involved in the group, it's a very positive situation for him," Pochettino said.

"We will wait and see how he is progressing in his problem."

The Spurs manager was equally positive regarding the prospects for the injured trio of Davinson Sanchez, Jan Vertonghen and Harry Winks. Meanwhile Pochettino faced fresh questions about his

own future. The Argentinian has been linked with Juventus following the recent departure from the Italian giants of Massimiliano Allegri, but Pochettino insisted his focus was firmly on Spurs' first appearance in a European Cup final.

"Today no one is more important than the game that we have ahead. Tottenham deserve that we are all 100 per cent focused on the game. We can make history, we can provide our fans the best happiness in football," he said.

Spurs midfielder Moussa Sissoko said the players were in a positive frame of mind ahead of a final against English rivals Liverpool, five-time kings of European club football.

"The spirit is fantastic, every time we were close to be out but we showed a lot of character to win the game,"

said Sissoko. "We know we can challenge against every team," the Frenchman added. "I am not scared of Liverpool or any team."

"We all need to challenge and we have to give our best and if we do it, we can beat any team. In the past we have showed it."

# Atalanta qualify for CL as Milan miss out

Atalanta won at Sassuolo on Sunday to secure their first ever Champions League spot and Inter Milan joined them while ensuring Empoli were relegated after a frantic second half in the San Siro.

AC Milan ended up fifth despite winning at SPAL. Genoa and Fiorentina stayed in Serie A after a nerve-wracked goalless draw.

The evening started with Inter, Atalanta, AC Milan and Roma battling for the two remaining Champions League spots and Empoli knowing that if they won they would survive.

Because their ground is being redeveloped, Atalanta had to cede home advantage and play at Sassuolo where they quickly fell behind.

Duvan Zapata levelled before half-time. After Sassuolo lost their scorer Domenico Berardi, who received a red card for his part in the mass brawl that ended the first half, Atalanta comfortably sealed third as goals by Alejandro Gomez and Mario Pasalic completed a 3-1 win.

"It's been an extraordinary season," Atalanta president Antonio Percassi told Sky Sport. "My first hug was for (coach Gian Piero) Gasperini, for a lifetime. It's already a given that he'll still be here next season."

Milan took a two-goal lead at SPAL, with goals by Hakan Calhanoglu and Franck Kessie, but Francesco Vicari and Mohamed Fares replied.

Meanwhile at the San Siro, after a goal-less first half, Inter brought on Keita Balde. The striker broke the deadlock with a solo goal six minutes later, earning a yellow card for ripping off his shirt in celebration.

The home team had a chance to increase their lead when Mauro Icardi tumbled over Empoli goalkeeper

Bartlomiej Dragowski. After a delay for video review, Icardi missed the penalty.

A few minutes later in Ferrara, Kessie rolled in a penalty to put AC Milan back in the lead against SPAL. They held on to win 3-2.

Back at the San Siro, Salih Ucan's low cross from the right reached Hamed Traore unmarked in front of goal and he levelled to lift Empoli out of the relegation places and push Inter out of the top four.

Five minutes later, Radja Nainggolan changed that when he pounced on a rebound to put Inter ahead.

In a frantic finish, Empoli came close several times with Inter centre-back Stefan de Vrij deflecting one shot onto his own bar.

In added time, with Dragowski in the Empoli attack, Inter rolled the ball into the empty net, but Balde had pulled Dragowski back in the build-up. The goal was disallowed and Balde earned a second yellow card.

Yet the 2-1 win was enough to save Inter and doom Empoli.

DE ROSSI SAYS GOODBYE The wins of the three teams above them meant Roma finished sixth despite beating visiting Parma 2-1. They also bid farewell to captain and local hero Daniele De Rossi who came off to rapturous applause with nine minutes to play.

Earlier on Sunday, Massimiliano Allegri ended his Juventus career in disappointing fashion as the champions were undone by two late strikes at Sampdoria to finish the Serie A season with a five-match winless streak.

Despite a poor final few weeks they still finished 11 points ahead of second-placed Napoli, who ended their underwhelming campaign beaten 3-2 at Bologna on Saturday.

# INDIA SEEK TO BOUNCE BACK FROM OPENING DEFEAT

Men in Blue look to find form & get back to winning ways against B'desh in 2nd warm-up tie

The top-order will ideally like an extended session in the middle but injured Kedar Jadhav and Vijay Shankar's lack of game time will certainly be a bigger worry for India ahead of their final World Cup warm-up game against Bangladesh here on Tuesday.

The top heavy Indian line-up flattered to deceive in bowling-friendly conditions at the Oval as Trent Boult troubled them with both swing and seam movement.

The six-wicket defeat against New Zealand however won't be a big worry for Virat Kohli as he has some bigger issues to take care of.

Kohli is bound to be a worried man if Jadhav and Shankar are unable to get a decent hit against Mashrafe Mortaza's men before facing a tricky opposition like South Africa in its tournament opener at Southampton on June 5.

India's primary objective during the practice games is to fix their middle-order problems but the two protagonists, who are likely to fill in the

important Numbers 4 and 6 in the tournament proper, have not fully recovered from their respective injuries.

While Kedar injured his left shoulder during the IPL, Shankar was hit in the nets by a Khaleel Ahmed short ball.

This, however, is a Godsend opportunity for KL Rahul to score some useful runs against an attack comprising Mortaza, Mustafizur Rahman, Rubel Hossain and Shakib al Hasan and cement the No 4 slot. Unless Ravi Shastri and Kohli decide to promote Dinesh Karthik and

check him out.

Shakib is recovering from a niggle and Bangladesh coach Steve Rhodes expects him to play a pivotal role in the 'Tigers' campaign.

Rohit and Shikhar, who have enjoyed a decent amount of success against Bangladesh, won't mind some runs which is always a confidence booster ahead of the main event.

If the conditions in Cardiff remain overcast, playing out a testing first spell of Mustafizur or Rubel will certainly keep the top-order batsmen in good stead.

Apart from Rahul, the other player who will like to assert himself in the middle will be Ravindra Jadeja, who was the only saving grace in the first warm-up game.

While Jadeja's core strength remains batting, his accurate bowling and razor sharp fielding will keep Jadhav on toes once he gets hundred percent fit.

An interesting move in the first game was to send Hardik Pandya at No 5 ahead of Mahendra Singh Dhoni, who literally struggled in tough batting conditions scoring 17 off

## KEY PLAYERS

**Jasprit Bumrah:** Bumrah impressed in the four overs he bowled against New Zealand, which included two maidens, giving away just two runs and snaring a wicket. That is the sort of performance that has become customary of Bumrah. He is the world's top-ranked bowler, and can be stifling with both his ability to contain runs and pick up wickets.

**Shakib Al Hasan:** Bangladesh's talismanic all-rounder can do it all on the field. He is a strike bowler, gets in handy overs through the middle overs with his accuracy, makes vital runs across a number of positions and can help construct the innings. Shakib took two wickets in three matches during the Ireland tri-nation series, and struck two unbeaten half-centuries, giving a glimpse of how crucial he is to Bangladesh's chances at the World Cup.

Overcast conditions are expected throughout. Chances of rain peak at 11am local time, which is half an hour after the start, so we could potentially be in for another delayed start. The essence of this match increases further given the fact that their senior players Chris Gayle, Andre Russell weren't a part of the recently concluded tri-series in Ireland. Chris Gayle's form during the home series against England and Shai Hope's consistency in recent times will act as a huge morale booster for the two-time World champions.

The bowling unit has consistently failed to take wickets in recent times. The new ball pair of captain Jason Holder and Sheldon Cottrell have not been able to create any opportunities, conceding runs at over run-a-ball in their nine-over combined spell against South Africa. To add to the woes, Shannon Gabriel, who left the field after bowling the first two balls of the ninth over, didn't take the field post the first rain interruption. He seems to have suffered a strain of some sort. The team management and the fans will hope that the Trinidad pacer recovers quickly before their first game against Pakistan in the tournament proper.

## Bangladesh happy with underdog title

Bangladesh coach Steve Rhodes believes the team is well prepared going into the World Cup and they are happy with the "underdog" title.

Bangladesh didn't have an ideal start to their preparation for the World Cup as their first warm-up game against Pakistan was washed out on Sunday. They will now take on India in their second practice match on Tuesday before beginning their tournament campaign against South Africa on June 2.

"One of the things the dressing room feels is quietly confident," Rhodes told ICC. "But we are well aware that we are playing against some very good teams. We respect the opposition; we don't fear them. But what we have been trying to do is play that down a little bit, and actually it is great to be an underdog."

"Because if we can keep surprising all these big teams, everybody is going to be commenting about what is going on with Bangladesh — 'how do they do this sort of thing; how do they keep doing this sort of thing?' If we don't get too big for our boots, then we will keep surprising, and we should handle the pressure a lot better," he added.

One of the key boosts for Bangladesh will be the availability of Shakib al Hasan, the number one all-rounder, who had missed the series against New Zealand due to a finger injury.

Shakib recovered from that injury in time for the IPL and played an important role in Bangladesh winning their first ever non-bilateral ODI tournament in Ireland, scoring two unbeaten fifties and bowling economically. However, he missed the final with a side strain.

The 32-year-old is now fit again in the lead-up to the World Cup, and, according to Rhodes, the presence of the T20 captain will have a great impact on Bangladesh's campaign.

"When he (Shakib) doesn't play, it can cause a few issues. Not only (in) missing the best player that you have got, but also your balance of the team," said Rhodes.

The Bangladesh coach also heaped praise on Mashrafe Mortaza saying, he leads in a warrior-like fashion.

"He (Mashrafe) is very much the person at the front, very much the person that people respect. He wouldn't ask anybody to do something that he couldn't do or wouldn't try himself," said the Bangladesh coach.

# 'Variety in bowling makes India strong contender'

Former Australia skipper Ian Chappell believes the Virat Kohli-led India has variety in their bowling department, making them a strong contender to win the 2019 World Cup.

Chappell said the team which has the ability to pick wickets at regular intervals, particularly in the middle overs, was likely to lift the coveted Cup.

"In an era where big bats and big scores, with occasional monumental battering, have proliferated ODIs, there are still some seriously good bowling attacks gearing up for 2019 World Cup," Chappell wrote in his column in ESPNcricinfo.

"Wicket-taking is going to play a crucial role in deciding this World Cup. Despite the modern gung-ho batting style, this is not an easy contract to fulfil when the tournament



reaches the knockout stage. The team that consistently takes wickets — particularly through the middle overs — is the one most likely to lift the trophy," he added.

According to Chappell, India — despite not possessing the "outright pace" like that of England and Australia — do have great variety and a trio of fast bowlers who can be exceptional in favourable conditions.

"If there's any moisture in

the pitches then Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Shami and Bhuvneshwar Kumar are skilled enough to take full advantage. If, however, the pitches start to wear and the conditions are dry, then Kuldeep Yadav and Yuzvendra Chahal are a dangerous wicket-taking combination," said the 75-year-old.

"Throw in Hardik Pandya as a handy fast-bowling all-rounder and Virat Kohli has plenty of options," he added.

## Roy completes Eng rout

Jason Roy sealed an England thrashing of Afghanistan as the tournament hosts cruised to victory in their final match before the World Cup.

Roy made 89 not out on his Surrey home ground on Monday as England hammered outsiders Afghanistan by nine

wickets with nearly 200 balls to spare.

England, two days after losing their previous practice match to world champions Australia, returned to winning ways in convincing fashion ahead of their tournament opener against South Africa at the Oval on Thursday.

A target of 161 was never

likely to test England, with Roy proving as much in a 46-ball innings that included 11 fours and four sixes.

Jonny Bairstow was stumped by Rahmat Shah off Mohammad Nabi for 39.

Roy ended the match in the 18th over of England's reply with a six over midwicket.

Earlier, Jofra Archer and Joe Root took three wickets apiece as Afghanistan slumped to 160 all out.

Fast bowler Archer struck twice with the new ball to dismiss Hazratullah and Rahmat before ending some late resistance from Nabi.

Opener Noor Ali scrapped his way to 30 before he played on to all-rounder Ben Stokes.

Asghar tried to drive Root over the top but found Roy in the deep instead.

Afghanistan lost their next four wickets in a mere seven deliveries, Hashmatullah and Najibullah Zadran carelessly run out, Gulbadin Naib holding out to Moeen Ali and Rashid Khan steering Root to slip for a golden duck.

Afghanistan were in danger of being dismissed for under 100 before Nabi, with 44, helped the last two wickets add 68 runs.

Nabi's defiant hitting, which included three sixes, kept England at bay before he was last man out when a thick edge off Archer carried to Bairstow on the boundary.



## Khawaja suffers injury scare

Australia were dealt an injury scare on Monday after top-order batsman Usman Khawaja limped off the field after getting hit on his left knee during their second and final World Cup warm-up match against Sri Lanka here.

## Will do everything to win the trophy: Guptill

They missed out on a fairy-tale ending in the previous edition but New Zealand will leave no stone unturned to lift their maiden World Cup trophy this time, says their swashbuckling opener Martin Guptill.

New Zealand started the warm-up games with a bang, slaying tournament giants India by six-wickets and 77 balls to spare.

"I wouldn't say we are favourites to win the World Cup this time but we have named a strong squad. We know it's going to be a tough tournament. We are going to try our best, do everything we can to go and win the trophy we missed out on the last time," Guptill said.

New Zealand have landed in the UK with an experienced and balanced side and the English pitches are likely to suit big hitters like Guptill, who will be crucial to the team's success.

Guptill has an impressive record in England. He has scored 652 runs with a strike-rate of 97.31 which includes an unbeaten 189 from 155 balls.

New Zealand, considered perennial dark horses, know how to punch above their weight.

"The tournament (2015 World Cup) was really good for



us. We played some really good cricket but unfortunately for us, we played our worst game in the final."

Many of the players who were part of the 2015 squad have been replaced by youngsters including former captain Brendon McCullum and spinner Daniel Vettori and Guptill feels the team needs to gel well together to achieve results like last edition.

"To be honest, it's a completely different team and it's a different time, it's four years later, so we need to come together and do what we do like last time. We have to make sure everybody is gelling well and are having some fun together because that was the biggest take away from last time."
