Swearing-in at Shivaji Park; Dy CM post goes to NCP, Speaker to Cong

It will be an emotional moment for Uddhav Thackeray and a historic occasion for the Shiv Sena when he takes oath as the 19th Chief Minister of Maharashtra on Thursday evening, along with his team of Ministers from the "Maharashtra Vikas Aghadi" at the historic Shivaji Park ground, which in many ways remained his late father Bal Thackeray's "karma bhoomi" from the day he addressed his first-ever Dussehra rally 53 years ago and till he was cremated there seven years ago. The first-ever Thackeray

to assume a top elected position, 59-year-old Uddhav will be second-ever Shiv Sena leader —
after Manohar Joshi — to be
sworn in as the Chief Minister
at "Shiv Thirth", better known as Shiyaji Park, Late Thackeray, it may be recalled, had hand-picked and anointed Joshi as the first-ever Sena Chief Minister, after the Sena-BJP alliance rode to power for the first time in March 1995. It was another mat-ter that the late Sena chief replaced Joshi with another leader Narayan Rane nearly four years later. Rane had taken oath of office at another venue.

Bal Thackeray, whose mor-

emotionally attached to the Shivaji Park, where he had addressed his first Dussehra rally more than four months after he founded the Shiv Sena on June 19, 1966, and went on to address Dussehra rallies there to address Dussella failles lifere every year thereafter, barring two years. In 2005, the Sena had cancelled the rally owing to heavy rain, while Thackeray could not make it to the October 24, 2012 Dusselra rally owing to his indisposition (but his video-recorded speech was played at that rally).

Though his party's official mouth-piece "Saamana" which began its publication on January 23, 1988, late Thackeray had all along effectively used Shivaji Park to send across his directives to lakh of supporters across Maharashtra. His son Uddhav

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

She said employment is a major concern in Potka but she was helpless. "People of Potka are not willing to give land for industrialisation. Though Bhushan Steel wanted to set up a plant but people were not willing to part with their land. I had convinced them a lot but they paid no heed," Menka.

Menka added she was not taking her opponents lightly and has a direct contest against JMM's Sardar, whom she

beat by over 6,000 votes in the 2014 State elections. Menka, a BA (Hons) from Lal Bahadui Shastri Memorial College in Karandih, Jamshedpur is confident to win the election again. Both Sardar and Bullu have

intensified their campaign. Both are raising unemployment and education issues to con-

On the other hand according to reports Menka Sardar's popularity graph has declined over the years and party activists are angry with her. Despite being the sitting MLA it would be tough for her to regain the seat.

In 2005 Assembly elections 2005, Amulya Sardar had defeated arch rival Menka Sardar with a margin of 13,759 votes. While in 2000 Assembly elections, BJP candidate Menka Sardar trounced JMM candidate Krishna Mardi to win

Ramesh Murmu, a political activist said that the lack of



basic infrastructure facilities is still a distant dream for the residents of Potka.

Congress concerned only about Gandhi family, says Amit Shah

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

Accusing Congress of being Concerned only about the security of the Gandhi family, Home Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday in the Lok Sabha said the SPG protection enjoyed by the family was withdrawn only after the through security review.

Replying to the allegations raised by Congress MPs during the debate on the amendments to the SPG Act, the Home Minister said Congress never raised noise on the security of former Prime Ministers like Chandra Sekhar, Narasimha Rao, Deve Gowda or IK Gujaral and reiterated that the Gandhi family's current security by the

CRPF is foolproof. The Bill was passed amid a walkout by the Congress.

Replying to the debate on the SPG (Amendment) Bill, he asserted that the BJP did not carry out any action with a vindictive approach and it was the Congress which took many such decisions in the past. He said that the security cover has in fact been increased for the Gandhi family. Home Minister also narrated several instances of family members skipping the SPG cover and creating prob-

lems for the security personnel. "Impression is being created that the SPG Act is amended to withdrew security from the Gandhi family. This is not the fact. Security of the Gandhi family has not been withdrawn but changed to 'Z-plus' with advance security liaison and ambulance that will be given across the country," he said.

According to the amendment, the SPG will now protect the Prime Minister and members of his immediate family residing with him at his official residence. It will also provide security to former Prime Ministers and their immediate family members staying with them at the residence allotted for a period of five years from the date on which they cease to

hold the office. "This Government wants to provide security to every political party and is already proreal party and is already providing the same. But political leaders can't be given equal security as provided to the Prime Minister of the country," he said. Shah said after 2015. Rahul Gandhi has in fact travelled 1,892 times in India and 247 times abroad without informing the SPG. "Members of the Gandhi family have travelled abroad on many occasions without informing the SPG. Instances like this has hapned about 600 times." he said

travelled 50 times in Delhi, 13 times in various parts of India and 29 times abroad without informing the SPG. Priyanka Gandhi had travelled 339 times in Delhi without taking the SPG cover, 64 times in different parts of the country and 94

times abroad, he said.

Shah said the Director of the Intelligence Bureau personally went to meet former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and conveyed to him about withdrawing SPG cover and assured him that after threat assessment, there was no need for the SPG. "Manmohan Singh Ji himself asked Director IB to do what he feels is right. There's no point of not responding to his letter," he said.

The Home Minister said the IB Director sought time from the members of the Gandhi family to inform them about the decision of with-drawal of SPG coverage but was told "whatever you want to do, please go ahead". Shah said post

attached an immovable prop-erty in the form of a residential bungalow valued ₹1 crore situated in Shyam Nagar, Jaipur.

Investigation under PMLA was initiated on the basis of FIR and chargesheet filed by CBI

against the Chordias and firms linked to them like Vipul Gems Pvt. Ltd., KV Exports and Vipul Gems.

These entities had cheated

Despite various measures put in place by the Central Government, onion prices have once again breached the psy-chological mark of ₹100 a kg in several parts of the country. The ouffer stock of onion has already been liquidated. The situation is expected to remain the same till December end as onion supply in domestic markets yet to be improved. Two high-level committees — one headed by Union Home Minister Amit Shah and second by Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gauba — have been set up to look into the skyrocketing

onion prices.

Sources said that the Government is making an effort to import onion from Turkey, Egypt and Holland immediately to cool down the retail level spike. According to Food and across the world except for Egypt, Turkey and Holland. "Indian Missions in these coun-tries are also trying to facilitate the movement of stock from these countries," he said. Officials said that the buffer stock of 56,000 tonnes of onion has already been liquidated. "There is a shortfall of 50 per cent in supply in the local markets due to shortage," sources

According to sources, the time period for stock holding limit has been extended until further December end and the stock holding limits will remain the same.
On Wednesday, onion was

selling for anything between Rs 100 and 70 a kg in the national capital. In Coimbatore, onion

breached the Rs 120 a kg mark. The wholesale prices of onions were between Rs 50 and Rs 60 a kg and the retail price Rs 80 a kg last week. In Lasalgaon and Nashik mandis, the wholesale price of onion was crossed Rs 70 per kg. Onion prices witnessed a sharp jump since October, with rates in local markets across the country touching Rs 100 per kg. However, prices till last week were hovering between Rs 60 and ₹70 per kg in several parts of the country.

In a move to control prices the Government halted the export of onions, is importing (this will go on for a bit, not like all of it is in the country) and cracked down on those suspected of hoarding. The current rise in onion prices is a

bounded by excessive rainfall in onion-growing areas, which has delayed the harvest period by a week or so. About 90 percent of India's onion comes from the states of Karnataka, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and West Bengal. Govt mulls making BIS standard mandatory for piped drinking water

Taking note of samples drawn from 20 State capitals were not as per the specification 'Indian Standard (IS)-10500:2012' for drinkng water, the Ministry of Consumer Affairs is working on a plan to make the BIS standards on piped drinking water mandatory to ensure safe and quality water to people.

The proposal comes amid tests

conducted by the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) on drinking water, which found water quality in Mumbai as per standard but poor in many state capitals, including Delhi. The Ministry of Consumer Affairs has written to Jal Shakti Ministry to this effect. According to Food and Consumer Affairs Minister Ram Vilas Paswan, the Centre has the power to make BIS standard (on piped drinking water) mandatory.

None of the samples drawn from Chandigarh, Thiruvananthapuram, Patna, Bhopal, Guwahati, Bengaluru, Gandhinagar, Lucknow, Jammu, Jaipur, Dehradun, Chennai, Kolkata complied with the requirements. The Consumer Affairs ministry has written a letter to the Jal Shakti ministry to make it mandatory," Paswan

13th Tibetan Religious Conference begins

 $T^{he\ 13th\ Tibetan\ Religious\ Conference\ began\ in}_{Dharamshala\ on\ Wednesday\ where\ religious\ issues}_{like\ the\ reincarnation\ of\ the\ Dalai\ Lama\ are\ likely\ to\ be}$

The annual event comes after a gap of two years as the programme was cancelled last year ostensibly due to the unavailability of the 17th Karmapa Ogyen Trinley

The Karmapa did not return to India despite repeated prodding by the Dalai Lama who decided to go ahead with the conference in the absence of Dorje who had fled from India last year following money laundering

The Dalai Lama has invited the heads of all the sects of Tibetan Buddhism for the three-day Conference that deliberates on religious issues concerning the Tibetan community. Kagyu sect Karmapa Ogyen Trinley Dorje, who is recognised by the Dalai Lama, is facing challenge to his title by Trinley Thaye Dorje who also claims to be the Karmapa of the sect.

While Ogyen was given refugee status by the Government of India, Thaye holds an Indian passport. Ogyen who is facing a money laundering case in Himachal Pradesh fled surreptitiously from India last year and later acquired a Dominica Republic passport. Following this, he did not return to India, leading to the cancellation of the 13th religious conference la This year, the Government has refused to grant him a visa to attend the Conference, sources said

The Dalai Lama recently articulated that while Karmapa is an important spiritual teacher but it is not the individual who should be relied upon. Dalai Lama's assertions come in the wake of his sincere efforts to keep Tibetan Buddhists united. Dalai Lama had been con sistently asking the fugitive Karmapa to return to India but to no avail. The Dalai Lama had even facilitated a meeting of the two Karmapas last year in France in his

bid to keep the two factions united.

Leaving the e-cigarette Sabha squirming, the Lok Sabha eaving the e-cigarettes lobby on Wednesday gave green sig-nal to the Bill that seeks prohibition of e-cigarettes in India with Union Health Minister, Harsh Vardhan, calling the ban as a "pre-emptive strike" on the "hazardous" addiction.

E-cigarettes are battery-operated devices that produce aerosol by heating a solution containing nicotine. These include all forms of Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS), Heat Not Burn Products, e-hookah and the likes.

Harsh Vardhan said in the Lok Sabha that with the Prohibition of Electronic Cigarettes (Production, Manufacture, Import, Export, Transport, Sale, Distribution, Storage and Advertisement) Bill, 2019, the government wants to save the large youth population of the country that

Bill to ban e-cigarettes passed would have been targeted by ecigarette companies.

He said that vaping is harmful for the health of the people and "less harmful does not mean it is not harmful" as people claim it is less harmful than cigarettes.

The government felt the need to stop the growing use of e-cigarettes and similar products among youth. It is difficult to ban a product such as tobacco and alcohol once it gains a large consumer base and social acceptance. Currently, e-cigarettes do not have a large consumer base in the country.

Therefore, the ban will be hly effective," Harsh highly effective," Harsh Vardhan told Lok Sabha during the discussion after introducing the bill in the house on 22 November.
"Lack of ban on tobacco

cannot be the justification for not banning a new addiction which India cannot afford. Chemicals in nicotine used for e-cigarette can cause cancer,

effects adolescent brains," he said. The statutory resolution moved by opposition members to oppose the ordinance was defeated by a voice vote. The House also rejected several amendments moved by opposition members.

According to the Bill that seeks to replace an ordinance issued on September 18, any person who contravenes these provisions will be punishable with imprisonment of up to one year, or a fine of up to one lakh rupees, or both. For any subsequent offence, imprisonment of up to three years along with a fine of up to five lakh rupees. The proposed legislation prohibits to use any place for the storage of any stock of e-cigarettes and a person storing stock of e-cigarettes, will be punishable with an imprison-

ment of up to six months, or a fine of up to Rs 50,000, or both. Lok Sabha members argued over regulation instead rettes. Explaining the challenge Harsh Vardhan said that unlike traditional cigarettes, e-cigarettes do not contain tobacco and therefore are not regulated under the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA), 2003. The COTPA Act, regulates the sale, production, and distribution of cigarettes and other tobacco prod-ucts in India, and prohibits advertisement of cigarettes.

During the debate in the

lower house, members also questioned not punishing the users of ENDS. In reply to the discussion, health minister said that the Government did not want to punish the users, who are anyway the victims of e-cigarettes. "We didn't want to criminalise the usage of e-cigarettes because it was way more difficult to regulate the users The idea is to eventually make e-cigarettes unavailable in the market so that people cannot use them," Harsh Vardhan said.

WB Govt directs hospitals to follow WHO guidelines on dengue treatment not being followed by several

Kolkata: With dengue deaths in West Bengal since January touching 25, the State Health Department has issued an advisory to hospitals asking them to strictly follow the treatment protocol based on WHO guidelines after several medical establishments were found flouting it.

The advisory, issued last week, has made it mandatory for all government and private hospitals in the state to conduct dengue and scrub typhus tests on any person suffering from fever for five days, officials said on Wednesday.
"It has come to our notice

that the World Health Organisation (WHO) guide lines on conducting tests for dengue and scrub typhus were

medical establishments, following which the advisory was issued. "We have been abiding by the protocol in the state for several years as per norms prevalent across the globe," a health department official said.

He said the department would monitor the medical institutions to ensure that the protocol is being followed. "Establishments found

flouting it will be penalised," he said. Some 25 people have succumbed to dengue and more than 40,000 have been affected by the disease in the state since January, officials said. Besides, two deaths due to scrub typhus have also been reported from the districts of the state, they said. **PTI**

Touching new heights

2019 has been a very successful year for Indian space missions. But there's a steady long way to go



espite the public failure of India's mission to land a probe on the lunar surface, 2019 has seen the country take massive strides in space exploration. Those who remember how Indian rockets used to blow up at every second launch not that long ago, are all amazed at how we have come. We have sent missions to the moon and Mars. Plans are afoot to have a manned spaceflight within the next five years. But the latest milestone by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is telling. The 49th flight

of India's PSLV rocket not only launched a new image-mapping satellite into the orbit but also carried 13 nano-satellites, barely much larger than a hardcover book. These are being used by smaller nations as well as research institutes across the world, who are exploring the final frontier as well. With the 13 satellites launched by PSLV C-47 — all from the US — India has now carried over 300 such for foreign nations. Even though we cannot compete with the commercial launch abilities of the US, Russia and the European Space Agency, we have carved out a niche for ourselves with our precision and cost-competitiveness. One that has resulted in a ₹6,289 crore revenue for ISRO in the last three years. Besides CARTOSAT will address the needs of large-scale urban planning, rural resource and infrastructure development, coastal land use and cover. This data is of value to any policy-maker. We must, however, remain wary of the tremendous developments being worked on by private space entrepreneurs in the US, particularly Elon Musk and Jeff Bezos, both of whom are driving organisations, making some critical breakthroughs in reusable space hardware. They will likely power the US' future space endeavours as the general public across the world has begun to wonder why man abandoned the deep space exploration on the 50th anniversary of Neil Armstrong's first steps on the moon.

If there is an area where the Indian space missions could do better, it is to intensify collaboration with other space agencies. No Indian citizen has been into space since Wing Commander Rakesh Sharma in 1984. Although astronauts like Kalpana Chawla and Sunita Wlliams made it, they became American citizens. It is unfortunate that no Indian, or for that matter Chinese, has been to the International Space Station. Of course, as a cartoon in a global newspaper highlighted, there is still a horribly racist tinge to the way many foreign Governments look at India's space ambitions. We have to be open to new ideas as well as technology. While there are some inherent risks, it would be silly to spend thousands of crores in duplicating technologies that have already been perfected in other nations. And while it might seem like a controversial idea to some, India could also look at collaborating with China, which is seemingly locked out of the Western space race, and jointly develop some projects. While ISRO is a matter of pride and our prudence with costs is a good thing, the fact is that given the economic times we are living in, we have to tighten our purse strings and make every rupee count for more. Collaboration with other nations as well as private organisations might not be a bad thing.

Down the toilet

The Government's tall claims on ODF status have fallen flat after the NSSO report reveals uncomfortable truths



nfortunately, the thin line between truth and lies has blurred so much that we do not know where fact-finding ends and myth-making begins when it comes to government data. The resultant trust deficit has not only cost the Narendra Modi Government its image but some of its good intentions. There's no gainsaying that the Swachh Bharat Mission did bring about a toilet revolution in the country but there are miles to go yet. So though Modi announced that 99 per cent of our villages had declared themselves open-

defecation free (ODF), neither he nor us can overlook reality. And now his Government's own figures belie his claim. The National Sample Survey Office (NSSO) data shows that only 71.3 per cent of rural households had toilets built in their homes. Not only that, about one-fourth of them had no access to toilets till December 2018, indicating a tardy pace of implementation instead of mission-mode seriousness. Of much concern is the fact that respondents of the survey were coerced into giving out false figures in return for availing benefits of other Government schemes. Besides faltering on releasing inconsistent data, the Government committed a larger offence: Withholding the NSSO data, which ought to have been released before Modi's announcement. Clearly, this was done to build up a propagandist swell before the Assembly elections and blow some trumpet before the international community. So the Government arrogantly decided to keep to its fables and bubbles of self-gratification. This even after it faced the heat of economists and statisticians for concealing crucial employment data. which was released only after the general elections were over. Actually the Swachh Bharat Mission was one project that did not need dressing up. Given the scale of its implementation, it must be accepted that it has achieved much more than any other drive aimed at improving rural sanitation. The Government could have harped on "significant progress" rather than exaggerating figures. Among those households that have access to toilets, 94.7 per cent males and 95.7 per cent females in rural areas regularly use them.

The pursuit of this mission should not be hasty but multi-pronged and there should be no rush for a tag until all parameters have been met. For example, the lack of water supply is the biggest hindrance. There is still insufficient knowledge about how to manage the faecal sludge in pits and sewer tanks, dispose them in the absence of an outlet or convert them to manure and biogas. In other words, a sanitary sub-structure that has been mandated by the Jal Shakti Ministry needs to be completed as a second-tier plan before we pin convenient tags. With the Government emphasising the construction of twin leach pit toilets, which can address the issue to an extent, only 30 per cent of our total toilets is of this variant. Sludge management itself is a complex procedure. To compound the problem, most States do not have sufficient sewage treatment plants (STPs). If the Government doesn't want to live with another unfinished agenda, then it needs to first ensure a forward linkage of waste management and a uniform protocol that will help bring about attitudinal and behavioural change among the masses. Yet it continues to wear the blinkers, choosing instead to lambast the NSSO data and refusing to accept that eventually, no fudging is smart and will get detected. A robust solution comes only with the acceptance of reality, not its denial. Data collection needs to be transparent and a strict methodology must be adhered to. Otherwise, policy-makers will be flying blind as they grapple with our development goals. Should we be a winner or just pose as one? That is the question we need to answer as the world doesn't exactly float on hot air.

Don't play with data

Recent accusations of data manipulation do no good either to the Modi Government or the country. The refusal to face the truth will hurt the economy



ast week, over 200 researchers, academicians and planners from India and abroad signed a petition, demanding that the Union Government release the survey on household consumption expenditure con-ducted by the National Sample Survey Office (NSSO), now the National Statistical Office (NSO), which has allegedly been withheld by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI). Academicians have also urged the Government to make all other survey data public. A few days ago, the MoSPI had announced its decision to not release the NSO's household consumption expenditure data for 2017-2018. According to a report that was leaked to the Press, the monthly per capita consumption expenditure by an Indian fell by 3.7 per cent. The NSO report was supposed to be released in June this year but was scrapped on account of data quality issues. According to the Government, there are sharp differences between estimates of the NSO survey data and that of the National Accounts Statistics (NAS).

Any data user in the country knows how the Indian statistical system works. In fact, consumption surveys are known to give results that diverge from macro-economic estimates of the national accounts. While the NAS presents the estimates of macro-economic aggregates, the consumption expenditure is calculated on micro-level data, based on the household survey. Therefore, the Government's reason that it has withheld the reports because of "data quality" issues does

not hold ground.
With the Government making tall claims of its successful performance on the economic front, the decline in average consumption must have come as a real embarrassment for the simple reason that this happened for the first time in the last four decades and supports the argument that the economy is indeed seeing a downturn. According to the last NSSO report in 2011-12, the per capita monthly consumer expenditure stood at ₹1,501 and the leaked report has pegged it at ₹1,446 for 2017-18. This shows a sharp decline in consumption expenditure in the period during the Modi 1.0 regime. On the economic front, contrary to the Government's claim of a 6.5 per cent growth rate, the actual figures are off the mark. Since demonetisation and the Goods and Services Tax (GST) were the two major headwinds that held back India's economic growth, it would have been more embarrassing for the Government to admit a reduction in household expenditure after these two major economic steps of the Modi regime backfired.

The NSO collects data on various aspects of the economy from time to time by taking periodic sample surveys. While small sample surveys are annual, large surveys, like on consumer expenditure, are conducted every five years. The NSO's most vital survey is on household consumer expenditure, which forms the basis for assessing the country's eco-

nomic progress, the success or failure of poverty alleviation schemes, estimates of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and disparity between various economic/social groups, among other things. To recall, the NSSOs household consumer expendi-ture survey for 2009-10 had become a subject of much controversy amid questions over overty estimates, which were ased on the survey.

UPA-II The then Government had appointed a committee headed by economist C Rangarajan to review the methods used for calculating poverty ratio. The 2009-10 survey was cancelled and a fresh one ordered. It was only in January 2015 that a new series of NAS was introduced. It is not yet clear whether the gap between the 2017-18 NSSO data and NAS was due to this change. The NAS's new survey was based on new base-year and the method of estimating the GDP, too, was revised.

No wonder then, the 2017-18 report was delayed. After 2011-12, the next round of data collection should have taken place in 2016-17. But now, while the 2017-18 data has been scrapped, the Government is exploring the feasibility of conducting the next Consumer Expenditure Survey in 2020-2021 and 2021-22 after incorporating all data quality refinements in the survey process. This means that new data will not be available before July 2023. This is a travesty considering that India is one of those countries where there is no official data collection

of household or individual income. And the entire economic planning is done on the basis of consumption expenditure data. This reflects poorly on a country that once boasted a transparent system where the methodology and estimates of the surveys were clearly understood and were applauded by the international community, too.

The is not for the first time that the NDA Government has undertaken this data manipulation exercise. There are many incidents in the recent past where the data produced by the Modi Government have been a subject to controversy. Questions were raised on former Chief Economic Advisor Arvind Subramanian's dramatic claim that the real GDP grew at a rate between 3.5 per cent and 5.5 per cent during 2011-12 to 2016-17. After quitting his post, Subramanian had questioned the methodology used to calculate GDP. Using other macrolevel indicators, he showed that actual growth rate could be much lower than claimed. Since this data was based on new series of NAS, many pointed fingers. It should also be mentioned that the back series calculations done by the Central Statistical Office (CSO) were different from the one presented by the National Statistical Commission (NSC). This issue was also much debated among economists working on Indian data. Even data collection for GDP estimates has not been free from blemishes. In 2016-17, the NSSO found that more than 35

per cent of the firms, from where the data was sourced, were either non-existent or wrongly classified in the data

Controversy also arose over the alleged suppression of the findings of the annual Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) on labour force. Divergent views were expressed by the Government and independent researchers on the rate of unemployment among all social groups. In this case, too, the Government tried to suppress the data, which was already made public, unofficially. Ultimately, the data collected by NSC was held up and the Government was

accused of manipulating data.

Over the years, there have been improvements in the timeliness of data compilation and dissemination. But the Indian statistical system is yet to match global standards. Most macro reports on all aspects of the economy are regularly published every year. This may be due to statutory requirement of placing annual reports before the Parliament. The most cru-cial weakness pertains to the survey based on data and the periodicity of its release. Most surveys, where data has to be gathered from the public, is conducted every four or five years. Its publication takes about 18 months (on an average). There is sufficient scope for improvements in the way we collect and disseminate data.

The NSC, too, remains mired in controversies. After its chairman and an external

member resigned, expressing disappointment over the treatment being meted out by the Government, questions have been raised on the internal functioning of the organisation. It is welcome that the Government gave more teeth to it with a legislation. In order to streamline the functioning of data collection, the two arms of the MoSPI — NSSO and the Central Statistics Office (CSO)

— were merged a few months ago. This move will likely fos-ter better coordination as the NSO now comes directly under the Government, headed by the

secretary of MoSPI.

It is unfortunate that the NSSO data on household expenditure has been with-drawn altogether. Releasing data selectively, which ensures positive results, and at the same time withholding uncomfort-able data reflects the lack of honesty on the Government's part. It also puts a question mark on the credibility of official statistics, which will always be a matter of suspicion now Statisticians and economists know the limitations of data based on sample surveys. MoSPI should have released the data on time with a disclaimer about the limitations. Data delayed is data denied. The Government must deal with real problems head-on and find tangible solutions instead of hiding behind the bush.

The real truth about Rama

If he had been the king of India today, he would have punished those who lynched Muslims, vandalised churches or oppressed the Dalits



oday, in the polarised and emotionally-surcharged and communalised atmosphere which has been created by the "Hindutva" forces that have taken control of India, Rama may be depicted and regarded by the Indian minorities (particularly the Muslims) as a fearsome oppressive entity, which symbolises lynching, terrorising and atrocities on them. But was Rama

We need not go into the controversy whether Rama was a mythological or historical figure, though it may be mentioned that behind every mythology there is usually some history. Homer's epic poem Iliad is regarded as Greek mythology but some evi-

dence of a Trojan war has been found by archaeologists. Similarly, my own opinion is that Rama was a great king who did good deeds and was later transformed into a god.

Indeed, in the original *Ramayana* of Valmiki (in Sanskrit) Rama is not a god but a human being. He was a prince, who later became the king of Ayodhya. It was about 2,000 years later, in the 16th century, that he was transformed into a god by Tulsidas in his epic Ramcharitmanas.

In Valmiki's Ramayana (which is the original Ramayana) there is a scene where king Dasharatha of Ayodhya, having become old, wants to anoint his eldest son Rama as his successor. But before doing so, he invites the people of Ayodhya and seeks their opinion on the issue. He wants to know whether they think that

Rama deserves to be their king after him.

The people of Ayodhya reply: "Nikhilenanu poorvya cha pita" putraan iva aurasaan. Shrushushante cha woh shishya kachit varmasu danshitaah. Iti woh purush vyaagrah sada Ramobhibhaashate. Vyasaneshu manushyaanam bhrisham bhavati dukhitah. Utsaveshu cha sarveshu pitév paritushyati. (O King, your son Rama indeed deserves to be the king. He behaves like a father to the people. He grieves when the people are in sorrow due to some calamity or tragedy and is pleased like a father when

the people celebrate festivals.)"
So, in the original *Ramayana*, prince Rama is described as a father to the people of the kingdom, who cares for all of them. A true father is one who takes care of all his children and not he that looks after only some and oppresses the others

So if Rama had been the king of India today, he would have looked after the welfare of all the people of the country and not that he would have only looked after the Hindus and oppressed the Christians, the Muslims, the Sikhs, the Parsis, the Dalits and other religious minorities. In fact, without a doubt, the just king Rama, would have given severe punishment to those who lynched Muslims or committed atrocities on them, vandalised churches or oppressed the Dalits and other marginalised or weaker sections of Indian society

In fact, I consider Rama, the just king, to be the great grandfather of the Indian nation. Just as I consider the third Mughal emperor Akbar, who reigned from 1556 to 1605, the "father of the Indian nation" and Emperor Ashoka, who ruled from 268 to 232 BC, the "grandfather of the Indian nation.

Let me explain why I called Akbar, the "father of the Indian nation." What we Indians are today is largely because of the solid foundation laid by Akbar, who gave equal respect to all religions. Because of Akbar, we are Indians, not just Hindus, Muslims, Sikhs, Christians, Jains, Parsis and so on, And yet the tragedy is that many Hindus call Akbar a Muslim, while many Muslims call him a Hindu (because he observed many Hindu festivals and cere

The truth is that while being a Sunni Muslim, Akbar was a true Indian and saw that Bharat was a country of great diversity. Hence the only way to keep the country united was by giving equal respect to all communities and sects. It was because of this realisation that Akbar adopted the wise policy of Suleh-e-Kul that is, universal toleration of all religions. This was in the 16th century when Europeans were massacring each other in the name of religion, Catholics killing Protestants and vice versa, and both murdering the Jews.

Going on to emperor Ashoka. I called him the "grandfather of the Indian nation" because of what he said in his 12th major rock edict: "All religions should be honoured. Whoever praises his own religion due to excessive devotion and condemns others, with the thought 'Let me glorify my own belief' only harms his own religion. Therefore contact (between faiths) is good. One should listen to and respect the doctrines professed by others."

These men were far ahead of their times in their thinking and were true Indians in every sense of the word and Rama is the great grandfather of the Indian nation.

Don't experiment on the poor

Underprivileged societies are being used as guinea pigs by development scientists. Encouraging the poor to take risks raises ethical questions because it is they, and not outsiders, who pay the price of failure

India has long been a testing ground for Euro-American products, particularly in agriculture and medicine — and of late, finance and insurance —whose producers make the most of loose regulations and the diversity of a huge population. This cuts research costs dramatically for lucative products to be sold in those countries, as also to promote the agenda of globalisation

The relationship is highly exploitative and many believe it represents a new form of colo-

nialism. Development is a new and fertile ground for such experimentation upon the underprivileged. Poor societies have become guinea pigs for development scientists. The Nobel Memorial Prize in Economic Sciences, funded by the Bank of Sweden, was recently awarded for such randomised, controlled trials that have changed the face of development economics.
What was earlier used for clinical trials of medicines has now become a tool for gauging the effi-cacy of financial and social medicines.

On account of a lack of proper awareness and failure of institutions to properly guide them, people buy insurance policies without planning and give up midway because they do not have money to pay the premium. Aggressive selling prevents the agents from properly assessing the consisten-cy in income streams of the buyers for servicing their policies. The customers end up losing heavily due to harsh penalties. There's a popular term

to describe this, it is called "mis-selling".

We often mistake innovation for invention Innovators are anything but inventors: They offer deliverables because their focus is on taking something already known and improving it. Inventions are the real breakthroughs as they transforming entire cultures for the better.

The commercial pitch: A fresh nuance in the innovation discourse is the concept of ideas which have potential business value or a strong commercial proposition. In the new paradigm, the net benefit to society is usually outweighed by the profit accruing to the innovators' finan-cial backers — the investors and political actors who now form a new and important element in the ecosystem. Most innovations are now being measured in terms of their commercial and business worth, and how effectively they can be pitched to the investment world. The language of innovation is now increasingly couched in financial jargon and we must acknowledge this new development, however disdainful it may appear to us. There may be innovations which bring substantial net benefits to society, particularly to those excluded from mainstream development but these may not find strong adherents because they don't have a robust business value.

Such innovations are oftentimes skewed and tailored to meet the needs of the rigid financial framework of the funders. This usually results in a compliance culture that is highly regiment-ed, leaving little scope for creativity and atten-

tion to other dimensions of clients' well-being.
This new dimension of development and innovation has both pros and cons. While it is being made out to be a win-win formula for the creators of the model and the recipients, given the influential position that the proponents enjoy on account of their financial and political muscle, it has degenerated into a monopolistic power for the funders. Microfinance is perhaps the starkest example of this.

There is now huge money in the field of inno-

tors who are targetting larger social problems. The strategy has several advantages. Since the targetted popu-lation is mostly illiterate and unempowered, the innovations are usually not subject to any rigorous scrutiny and negative objectives are brushed off with deft publicity efforts. Since the benefi-ciaries are from low-income and vulnerable segments, even a small benefit, despite some sections of the population suffering evil consequences, is telescoped into a great messianic act. Moreover, since such innovations have the backing of powerful people, they can easily demolish even genuine resistance based on authentic evidence of wrongs being done in the name of innovation. The real paradox is that most investors take an exit immediate-

ly after they have reaped benefits on their investment. They don't wait to see the longer term outcome of their investments and may not be around to answer and make themselves accountable when the evil consequences start appearing. There are times when entreappearing. There are times when entre-preneurs are quite well-intentioned but their funders may have a narrow agenda. Start-ups should think before going for external funding as the moment they do, the investors will run and govern the business and the founder can think only about returns and exit for the investors. and exit for the investors.

Flawed innovations: One must be

very clear about the deeper and ongoing benefit and purpose of innovation.

It may be aimed at simplifying processes, refining products or addressing bot-tlenecks in a system to improve delivery for beneficiaries or client. But, we cannot remain oblivious to the new problems that arise as byproducts of the

They could be perhaps more damaging than the ones they propose to fix. Much damage has been done to the enterprise and field of innovation by certification agencies and award juries when here leave in studying the who have been lazy in studying the actual worth of innovation or have shown haste in obliging their fellow ide-ologists or have been driven by nonethical considerations in awarding innovators. Several juries have severe ideological biases and that has vitiated

the entire climate for innovation.

A painstaking reflection of such interventions is imperative. New agri-cultural practices are being propagated with extravagant promises. By manipulating the choices of consumers at the low-income pyramid, the poor are being disempowered. The damage to the economy and ecology of these already fragile societies is now starkly visible. The cost of bearing the failure of these experiments can be significantly high for those who, apart from coping with harmful effects, also face the opportunity cost of setting them right.

Gandhian engineering: But not everything is bleak and dark. There is a tribe of socially-committed and conscientious entrepreneurs which is engaged in Gandhian engineering or frugal engineering. Its practitioners have pioneered the science of breaking up complex products or business models into their most basic forms and then rebuilding them in the most economic manner possible to tap the bottom of a market.

These conscientious entrepreneurs have successfully designed and introduced a wide range of affordable products that are sturdy enough to survive the demanding environment and are easy enough for a wide range of peo-ple to use. These range from solar-powered ATM bank machines to a detergent requiring little water.

A similar example is the "sacheti-sation" of commodities. The FMCG industry found that rural Indians wanted the same things as everyone else but they could only afford it in bite-sized packets. We can see streams of sachets dangling from crowded shelves and filled with anything from shampoo and cough syrup to coconut oil and mobile phone minutes.

A better way to drive a revolution of this type is through empathy. Not a form of sympathy that comes from superiority but one born of profound humility. It is an offering of respect, a moment of listening to stand in the shoes of another. The most successful leaders are those who recognise this truth and invoke it in the developmental interventions they shepherd. When we design solutions that recognise all we design solutions that recognise all as equal partners, we have a real chance of making it to the goalpost. Every society is going through different stages of development and the

necessary solutions and interventions must be appropriate for its unique cultural and economic context. By respecting the cultural outlook of the people and embracing their concerns we enlist their buy-in and that is what paves the way for enduring and sustainable suc-

Offshore wind power generation not in full force

At the end of 2018, the global offshore wind energy generated stood at 23 GW compared to 540 GW from onshore projects. With wind speed being a given asset, offshore production should have overtaken that of onshore operations

ffshore wind energy utilisation is a natural offshoot of the land-based wind power programme. However, despite the phenomenal progress in this decade, offshore wind energy is still a nascent sector with only two decades of serious research and development efforts.

At the end of 2018, the global off-shore wind energy generated stood at 23 gigawatts (GW) compared to 540 GW from onshore projects. With wind speed potential being a given asset, off-shore production should have overtaken the onshore creation statistics long ago but this is not the case.

Now, countries are removing obstacles in order to make offshore

wind energy generation a major success. For instance, the last two years have seen installations to the tune of 4.5 GW each around the world, supported by technological advance-ments and supportive policies. The main contributors to this power capacity are the United Kingdom (UK), Germany, the Netherlands and China. These countries have also made policies attractive for investors in these projects.
For instance, Nordic countries like

Denmark and Norway have removed penalties for project failure, emphasising on the importance of learning, over operation. As the offshore wind energy sector is based on expensive technology, pilot projects need support. This is generally in the form of investment subsidies. For instance, the UK provided large grants, to the tune of £10 million per plant, to the early off-shore developers.

Given the fast-paced global developments in this sector, India, with its over 7,000 km-long coastline, has immense offshore wind power gener-



ciable efforts in this direction. However, we are not quite there yet, even though the green energy portfolio aims at harnessing its entirely unex-ploited potential. For India, this is the right time to focus on offshore projects. This is because there is a lull in onshore wind energy generation in the country, with only 3.3 GW added in the last two years. Also, the whole world is focussing on renewable offshore wind power at the moment, so India can't be seen as lagging behind in this sector.

One of the main reasons for the

the fact that repowering of old wind farms with higher capacity turbines does not offer the same scale of generation as offshore projects. Keeping this in mind and the upbeat global sentiment, the Government has set an ambitious target of developing five GW of offshore capacity by 2022 and a further 30 GW by 2030. The National Offshore Wind Policy, 2015 provides the basic framework for offshore project development in the country as it allows for setting up of offshore wind farms up to 200 nautical miles. However, in a rider that may

not go down too well with many, developers can undertake project exploration and construction activities with just a 35-year lease from the Government, as per the Draft Offshore Wind Energy Lease Rules, 2019. Despite lofty targets aided by an ambitious Government policy, the ground realities are a bit different. The pace of development in many instances has been slow and the five GW target is out of reach. This is because project incubation itself takes six to seven years. While the Government is busy preparing the tenders, supply chain issues have been left unaddressed. Cost too is becoming a pressing issue.

The capital cost of offshore wind projects is roughly five-seven times higher than that of onshore projects. While turbines account for 60-80 per cent of the capital cost of an onshore project, they are only 30-50 per cent of the cost in case of an offshore project. Instead, the share of grid connection costs is higher at 15-30 per cent in case of offshore wind farms due to

the requirement of laying sub-sea cables. The Government must remove these bottlenecks immediately if success has to be achieved in getting the targetted power generation. The policy must make arrangements for the reduction of costs through customised turbine designs made for low-wind conditions, low labour cost as well as tax waivers Moreover, at present the tax bur-

den on the industry is estimated to be 30-31 per cent, which has led the developers to request the Government to waive off custom duties and impose only five per cent Goods and Services Tax (GST), in line with the concessions being provided to the oil and gas industry. This is crucial, considering that most of the projects are at present dependent on foreign technology. Unless these matters are resolved, the progress of offshore wind energy projects in India will be like taking two steps forward and three steps back-

India's fiscal deficit to be about 3.7% in FY20: Moody's

Ratings agency Moody's Investors Service has propected India's fiscal deficit to be about 3.7 per cent of the gross domestic product (GDP) in 2019-20, which will be slightly wider than the 3.4 per cent posted in fiscal 2019.

The Government has kept a fiscal deficit target of 3.3 per cent of the GDP for 2019-20.

The agency, in a report, said the persistent spending pressures and slower economic growth will result in continued

widening of the fiscal deficit.

"At fiscal year-end March
2020 (fiscal 2020), we project
Government deficit will be about 3.7 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP) for the Central Government and around 3 per cent for States, adding up to a general Government deficit of about 6.7 per cent," the report said.

In the report, the agency

cited that large fiscal deficits of some State Governments will also constrain Centre's medium-term consolidation goals. According to the agency, Indian States, which do not



generate sufficient revenue sources for their spending needs, remain dependent on Central Government's grants. These States have recorded larger deficits in recent years.

"The introduction of the GST replaced many indirect taxes previously levied by the States, reducing the share of own source revenue in their total revenue. As a result, States now rely on the Central Government or the GST Council for a majority of their

Trai moots idea of tariff calculator, more transparent disclosures

New Delhi: Telecom regulator Trai on Wednesday invited pub-lic views on enhancing transparency in disclosure of phone services rates and mooted an idea of introducing tariff calculator to help customers find the best plans to suit their usage.

Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (Trai) has sought views on higher trans-parency in details of unlimited data plans, where promised speed is provided only up to a certain level of usage and infor-mation is concealed in service thereafter.

"The transparency in communication is not only relevant to ensure that consumers benefit from the access to critical information regarding the product/service but also to maintain and increase the competition intensity, vital for growth and development of the sector," Trai said in its consultation paper on transparency in publishing of tariff offers.

The consultation paper from Trai has been issued when telecom operators have announced their plan to raise

He said there are provisions under Fundamental Rules 56(j), Rule 48 of Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 and Rule 16(3) (Amended) of All India (Death-cum-

Retirement Benefits) Rules, 1958, according to which the government has the absolute right to retire officials prematurely, on the ground of lack of integrity or ineffectiveness, in public interest, by giving notice of not less than three months in writing or three months' pay and allowances in lieu of such notice.

Such provisions can be applicable on a government employee if he is, in group 'A' or group 'B' service or post in a substantive, quasi-perma-nent or temporary capacity and had entered service before attaining the age of 35 years, and is over the age of 50 years, the Minister said.

Sensex, Nifty scale fresh closing peaks

Yes Bank rallies over 7 per cent

Market benchmark Sensex and Nifty on Wednesday scaled fresh closing peaks on hectic buying in banking, oil & gas and auto stocks amid posi-tive trends from global markets as investors latched onto hopes of a trade deal between the US and China The 30-share Sensex rose by 199.31 points or 0.49 per cent to end at a new life-time high of 41,020.61 as 24 of its constituents ended in the green.
The broader NSE Nifty

gained 63 points or 0.52 per cent to settle at a new peak of 12,100.70. According to analysts, sustained foreign fund inflow also buoyed the market sentiment. Foreign investors pur-chased shares worth Rs 4,677.75 crore on a net basis on Tuesday, provisional exchange data showed. Banking stocks advanced on rising expecta-tions of a rate cut by the RBI.

Yes Bank was the biggest gainer in the Sensex pack, rallying 7.65 per cent. SBI rose by 2.43 per cent after SBI Cards filed its IPO papers with SEBI. Kotak Bank was up 1 per cent, and IndusInd Bank by 0.64 per cent. HDFC gained 1.41 per cent at the close while HDFC Bank

edged up 0.29 per cent. Among other major gainers, SBI rose by 2.43 per cent, Maruti by 2.38 per cent, Sun Pharma by 1.87 per cent, HUL by 1.78 per cent and ONGC by 1.72 per cent. Tata Motors, Bajaj Auto and Hero MotoCorp rose more than 1 per cent. Infosys, HCL Tech, Reliance Industries and Vedanta Ltd also gained. Growing hopes that the US and China may soon reach an agreement to settle their trade disputes drove the market sentiment in global markets. US President Donald Trump said the talks were "in the final throes".

"Market was cheerful with the hope that the government will consider new scrappage policy while metals were positive about developments of the first phase US-China trade deal. Rate sensitive stocks like banks did well in expectation of rate cut

of Research at Geoitt Financial Services said. Short-covering ahead of the expiry of November Thursday also contributed to the rally, traders said.

Paras Bothra, President of Equity Research, Ashika Stock Broking said, "Domestic markets were volatile but eventual ly ended with gains led by pos itive global cues over US-China trade deal while F&O expiry and upcoming GDP data kept scepticism alive." L&T was the tor loser among Sensex stocks, end ing 2.05 per cent lower. ICICI Bank, ITC, Tata Steel, NTPC and Axis Bank too closed in the red. Broader BSE midcap and smallcap advanced up to 0.82 per cent. Sectorally, BSE auto, oil and gas, basic materials, metal, ener gy and healthcare indices ended up to 1.22 per cent higher. Most of the Asian markets were up on expectations of the US-China trade deal. Hong Kong gained 0.2 per cent, Tokyo rose by 0.3 per cent and Sydney by 0.9 per cent. However, Shanghai settled lower. 'Govt chalks out plan for ₹100L cr investment in infra over 5 yrs'

Carmakers should focus on alternative fuel vehicles: Gadkari

erming huge crude oil I import a "big economic challenge" for the country, Union Minister Nitin Gadkari on Wednesday urged automakers to focus on alternative fuel vehicles as well and ensured Government's support in the venture. Gadkari also stressed the need for diversifying agriculture towards power and energy to meet the goal of biofuel generation.
"I am giving you the con-

fidence from the government that we are all supporter of this sector...you have lot of apprehensions about the future icy but the government is keenly interested to support and encourage you for new development (alternative fuel vehiopment (alternative fuel vehi-cles). ...go ahead with old manufacturing but also encour-age alternative fuel;" Gadkari said addressing 'NuGen Mobility Summit 2019. He said the government's

approach is "import substitute, pollution free and cost effective" alternative to crude oil and the prime minister has specially given instructions to the Cabinet Secretary and Principal Adviser to work in this direction including on coal gasification and making methanol from that "The problem which is related to

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import bill is 20 per cent of our capital cost...it is a big economic challenge for the country. ..This is the time we have to find out some solution," the minister said stressing that the automobile sector is one sector which provides good revenue to the government with maximum employment potential.

Promising that the prob-lems of the automobile sector will be resolved. Gadkari said the intention of the government was not to create obstacles for them. Citing popular brands like Toyota and Hyundai, he said when these can manufacture flexi engines in Brazil why can't they do so in India where consumers can choose from various options including the alternative fuel.

The road, transport and

highways minister said India is the fastest growing economy and by 2030 it is expected to become the third largest economy in the world. Apart from crude oil imports, another major problem faced by the economy is in the agriculture sector with surplus production of sugar, rice and wheat, he said adding that there is a need for diversification of agriculture and forest towards producing alternative fuel power and energy.

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Congressional Committee invites Trump to attend impeachment hearing

PTI ■ WASHINGTON

A key Congressional Committee in the House of Representatives has invited US President Donald Trump to attend or send his officials to participate in the impeachment hearings against him.

House Judiciary Committee on Tuesday announced to hold its first impeachment hearing

against Trump next week.

Titled, "The Impeachment
Inquiry into President Donald J Trump: Constitutional Grounds for Presidential Impeachment" is the first in the third phase of the investigation, by the Democratic Party controlled House, into whether Trump abused his powers in pressing Ukrainian leaders to find dirt on his political opponents.

House Judiciary Chairman

Jerrold Nadler said that the impeachment proceedings against Trump is entering a new phase. That hearing will take place next Wednesday, December 4th at 10:00 am.

"Our first task is to explore the framework put in place to respond to serious allegations of impeachable misconduct like those against President Trump, Nadler said.
Nadler said that he has also

written to Trump to remind him that the Committee's impeachment inquiry rules allow for the President to attend the hearing and for his counsel to question the witness panel.
"At base, the President has a

choice to make: he can take this opportunity to be represented in the impeachment hearings, or he can stop complaining about the process. I hope that he chooses to \participate in the inquiry, directly or through counsel, as other Presidents have done before him," Nadler

said. Meanwhile in a series of tweets, Trump said that he would love to have his officials testify before the Congressional committees on impeachment, but he is block them as he wants to protect future presi-

dents.
"The DC Wolves and Fake News Media are reading far too much into people being forced by Courts to testify before Congress. I am fighting for future Presidents and the Office of the President," he said.

2016 Dhaka cafe attack: 7 **Islamists get death penalty**

bunal sentenced seven of the eight suspects to death on Wednesday for their involve-ment in the 2016 Islamist attack on a Dhaka cafe that killed 20 people, including an Indian girl, the worst terror attack in the

country's history.

"They shall be hanged by neck until their death," Dhaka's Anti-Terrorism Special Tribunal judge Mojibur Rahman pro-nounced at the crowded court complex in Old Dhaka as the convicts appeared in the dock under heavy security.

The convicts were found to have financed, supplied weapons, or assisted those who directly took part in the attack on Holey Artisan Bakery in Dhaka's up market Gulshan area on July 1,

The judge acquitted the eighth suspect as the prosecution

the attack by the outlawed Neo-Jamaatul Mujahideen Bangladesh (Neo-IMB).

Investigators earlier said that all the five neo-JMB operatives who directly took part in the attack were killed next morning in a counter assault by the military commandos.

The counter attack, however, killed an employee of the bakery and fatally wounded another who succumbed to his wounds two days later The 17 foreigners killed in

the attack included nine Italians, seven Japanese, one Indian girl. Two Bangladeshi police officers ere also killed during the seige.

The Indian girl, Tarishi Jain, student of the University of California in Berkeley, was among those killed in the attack. She was

Tamim Chowdhury as the mas-termind of the attack, who later was killed during a nationwide anti-militancy security clamp-

The verdict simultaneously observed that Chowdhury tried to draw Islamic State (IS) support to militant attacks in Bangladesh.

The IS had immediately claimed responsibility of the Holey Artisan attack and several other subsequent militant assaults

in the country.
But Bangladesh repeatedly declined the presence of any for-eign terrorist group in the coun-try attributing the incidents to megrown terrorists.

Security analysts and offi-

cials, however, said several Bangladeshi homegrown militant groups were in touch with or influenced by international terrorist outfits.

Cook County prosecutor James Murphy said Thurman became angry after George did not respond to his catcalls when she was walking from the campus to the parking garage early Saturday. He then followed George to the garage. Thurman "thought she was pretty" and wanted to talk to George. She \did not respond. This made him angry.

South Korea fires warning shots at North Korean ship

Seoul: South Korea's military fired warning shots on Wednesday to repel a North Korean merchant ship after it violated their disputed western sea boundary, Seoul offi-cials said, the second such incident in two months.

Seoul's Joint Chiefs of Staff said in a statement that it believes the North Korean ship crossed the sea boundary due to bad weather and an engine problem. No further violence was reported. It's the second time that South Korea has fired warning shots to drive back a North Korean ship in the area since South Korea's current liberal government took office in 2017. The first incident happened in September, according to South Korea's military. Ties between the two Koreas are strained amid a stalemate in US-led diplomacy on ending the North Korean nuclear crisis. North Korea said Monday its troops conducted artillery firing drills near the sea boundary. South Korea on Tuesday sent a formal protest message to North Korea, saying the drills violated last year's inter-Korean agreements aimed at reducing front-line military animosities.

Labour accuses UK PM of plot to 'sell' NHS to Trump

London: Britain's main opposition Labour party on Wednesday accused Prime Minister Boris Johnson of plot-ting a "toxic" deal with Donald Trump to allow US pharmaceutical companies access to the state health service.

Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn held up what he said were 451 pages of previously secret documents that proved Johnson was seeking to put the National Health Service (NHS) on the table in a post-Brexit trade deal.
Britain goes to the polls on December

12, with Johnson hoping to secure a majority to be able to push through his divorce deal to take the country out of the European Union.

onuments convey the thought and legacy of their creators in the timeline of human existence. We may agree or disagree with the legacy they embody. But one cannot ignore them as footnotes of our evolutionary history. Which is why we need to coopt them in our context and rebuild them with our own histories, add our own sub-

own histories, add our own sub-texts, drawing from lived experi-ences of the past. One way of doing that is to open these as venues of public engagement. World over examples abound. The Musee Picasso, which has 4,251 works of the painter, is housed in five adjoining medieval palaces in Barcelona's La Ribera paighbourhood in the Old City neighbourhood, in the Old City. The World Heritage Site of Qal'atal-Bahrain hosts archaeology walkathons every once in a while to enable people to learn about its architecture, maybe imbibe lessons or reinterpret them completely. The Hellenic Ministry of Culture and Sports Ephorate of Antiquities of Eastern Attica, Greece, conducts guided tours and folk performances at the archaeological site of Ramnous in Attica. The Agora of Athens is another archaeological site, which after many destruction and rebuilding cycles, has now been exposed to important functions and events ranging from the Archaic to Greco-Roman and Byzantine times. The Leeds Castle in England hosts various activities throughout the year like the Christmas Market, Annual Leeds Music Concert, and the Carnival

of History.

Delhi, too, is quietly making this transition as a city with a living heritage. The Drishyakala artwalks by DAG at the Red Fort, three-floor exhibition that housed 450 artworks that represent the 16th century Indian his-tory; the Delhi International Arts Festival at the Purana Qila; clas-

sical music concerts at the Lotus Temple and Old Fort, are some of the instances, where arts and culture have been moored by the surrounding relics. The State Archaeology Department (SAD) has also recently identified four monuments — Qudsia Bagh, Bhuli Bhatrayi Ka Mahal, Bawana Zail, and Bade Lao Ka Gumbad and thrown them open for cultural events like mushairas, qawwalis, shayari, exhibitions, artwalks, theatre, classical dance and music nights, and *dastangoi* sessions. Sahitya Kala Parishad, Shriram Bharatiya Kala Kendra and many other cultural academies have

been roped in to host the events. Another such example is also of the Kathakar Storytelling Festival, which was held at the recently-revived Sunder Nursery. Shaguna Gahilote, co-director of the festival, tells us the reason for choosing this particular venue. She says, "While working with the UNESCO, we talked about how monuments need to be opened for public gatherings. Since the festival was about storytelling, we didn't want it to be in a closed space. We wanted it to be in the open, especially if possible, under a tree, because the storytelling tradition had begun from that very place. And then, we felt, why not Sunder Nursery? But yes, the maintenance and cleanliness should be kept in mind and no damage should be done to the property if the space is being made available."

Filmmaker and storyteller Imtiaz Ali had also said at the festival that since the Sunder Nursery was a place to share and create stories, "the theme of storytelling is adding to the place's wike"

Art and heritage expert Asif Ali, who has closely worked on the restoration of the Nizamuddin Basti and Humayun's Tomb as a community project, says that inclusive in the evolving culture



even though there have been several events taking place around such monuments in the city, it is still a long way to go. He adds, "Not many programmes in the premises of historical buildings have been organised since taking permissions is a tedious job. *Jahan-e-Khusrau* festival, a programme conducted by Muzaffar Ali at the Humayun's Tomb has now stopped. And the reasons are still unknown. Being a part of the tourism industry, I have realised that organising heritage tours isn't sufficient. We need to get traction, especially during the evenings that will generate good

and traditions. Asif, therefore calls for a codified policy. "Opening these historic buildings for the community needs a wellcrafted policy. It could be a won-der for the next generation." One of the best examples, he points out, is of the revival of the Nizamuddin Basti and Humayun's Tomb, where people of the community were engaged with the conservation project closely and were also provided with appropriate and dignified employment opportunities. Inclusion of the people from the neighbourhood is the next and most critical

spect of the overall development,

Mehrauli Archaeological Park, Hauz Khas Village, Zafar Mahal in Mehrauli village, Tughlaqabad Fort, Lodi Garden and Mirza Ghalib ki Haveli are also being opened up in fits and starts. Opening up more such spaces has a critical role in making the society "resilient to social prejudice" and strengthening the relationships beyond socio-eco-nomic differences. Explains Asif,

"The lack of multi-purpose util-ity leads to ignorance among the masses. Which is why historic places are least important for people. So, far, we have had cultural programmes in such spaces. However, we have not devised any policy around their commeruse for events that would likely generate employment, awareness and substantial revenue for the government as well."

However, Atul Dev, con-

venor, INTACH Gurugram Chapter, warns against the kind of event to be held. "A mechanism needs to be set up for physical protection of monuments and for making people aware about their significance before we open spaces. Also, community gatherings are one thing and social meetings quite the other. One can organise festivals at such places related to the era the place belongs to. Currently, such places are only restricted to mushairas, shayaris and so on... because such events can take place against such backdrops. Since a number of monuments in Delhi are tombs or places of wor-ship, constructed by several generations of rulers, something like contemporary dances or modern music cannot be held against such backdrops. It wouldn't immerse in the aura of the

An official from SAD had also earlier said, "The theme of an event will be chosen on the basis of location of the structure. For instance, Bawana Zail, once the revenue office of the erstwhile British rule, will host rural folk programmes, which will facilitate community engagement."
When we discuss about how

heritage can be saved in the face of rampant urbanisation, Shaguna feels that community ownership of such sites is the first step. "In the West, many parks and heritage sites have already been opened for public use. It not only revives the value of that building but also gives the of that building but also gives the citizens a sense of ownership. Cities are quickly transforming so how can we conserve the tra-ditional structures, monuments and buildings and save them from encroachment? It's time to make these spaces available for the common public and arts to flourish more than just

Fleshing out the contours

Actor AAMIR BASHIR tells Sakshi Sharma that finding an older and more mature character within himself, for his forthcoming *Inside Edge* 2, was not easy

Enacting a character, the perception of whom has already been set in people's mind in the first season, is almost like doing a biopic," says actor Aamir Bashir, Amazon Prime Video's Inside Edge 2.

But Bashir is weighed down by expec tations. In the first season, the character was omnipresent though nobody had seen him. Says he, "Everyone had formed a distinctively appealing image of Bhaisaab. It was practically as if the audience was begging that this character should be revealed because they had their own interpretations of it. Bringing a fictional character to life was very exciting."

In the series, Aamir's characters wants to change the face of cricket by transforming it into a global sport rather than just being a Commonwealth one. But it is yet to be seen whether he is doing all this for the love of the game or if there's a different motive behind it. The season also has Arvind Vashistha (Angad Bedi) and Vayu Raghavan (Tanuj Virwani) pitted against each other as they are the captains of two different ams. They shared a great bond in the first season.

Bhaisaab is a middle-aged man and playing an older and more mature character was exciting for Aamir. "Older peo ple are more experienced and have more shades of grey. This allowed me to explore myself to a greater extent. I can recall one of my school plays where I played an old man and got a standing ova tion for it. That was the first time I felt I am good at it," says he.



However, portraying yourself as a person who is more mature than your actual age comes with its own challenges. "Finding an older, more mature and powerful character within ourself is not easy. But finding the kind of motivation the character has, was exciting. Every person has his/her own strengths, weaknesses and obsession. So you have to translate that in the character you are playing. This makes the challenge very person-al. It is always about find-ing the darker or lighter area within yourself," he says.

But the actor sees it as an opportunity to explore and learn some-thing new as it demands coming out of your comfort zone. Recently, in Sacred Games (2019), he played the role of Majid Khan, which was very different from this one

He says, "Majid was in

his 30s and a bit more

energetic, who had the power to manipulate people to make some change. Physically, he is laidback and a lot slower than Bhaisaab but at the same time, a little more measured. So by playing different roles, one's comfort zone also shifts."

After doing one of his films, A Wednesday, Aamir felt typecast. For a year and a half, he got similar roles. But as the digital space expands, it has given the actors a lot more scope to flesh out different roles. "It is always more gratifying to have some thing like the OTT platform. And this makes it an exciting time for actors as the format allows them space to experiment. You can give more layers to the role and make it more meaty. It's really a boom time, I hope it lasts," says he. The two seasons differ from each other

in various aspects, especially on account of the introduction of Bhaisaab. Aamir says that from season 1, "You know that he is the one whom people look up to even though they haven't seen or met him. So here all of that comes to life. You will get to see him in all his glory and how he over comes the challenges that he faces. This season is more exciting, eventful, with lots of twists and turns. And the threads that were left hanging in season 1 get fleshed out in

Samson replaces injured Dhawan for T20 series against West Indies



Open to keeping wickets, team is priority: Samson

IANS NEW DELHI

While the likes of Rahul Dravid and Gautam Gambhir have time and again praised the talent he possesses, critics have often said that consistency is an issue with Sanju Samson. And with head coach Ravi Shastri making it clear that the spot of a batsman who can keep is still open for the World T20 in Australia next year, the question on everyone's mind is if Samson can be the answer

Samson can be the answer.

After replacing injured Shikhar Dhawan in the T20I team for the Windies series, Sanju said that while he is open to keeping wickets, consistency isn't something that he loses sleep over. For the 25-year-old, it is more about playing match-winning knocks and seeing his team finish on top than personal glory.

"I have never thought of that (consistency) as an issue. What I have understood is that I am a bit different type of a player where I just feel that I should go and dominate the bowlers. So, when I have a style and I am looking to dom inate the bowlers, it can happen...if I go behind consistency, I will lose my style of batting. I don't want to change my style of

playing to bring in consistency.
"I like to keep things as simple as possible and when I get the opportunity I look to score big. If I get five innings, I want to score big in one or two innings and win matches for my team. Consistency in my innings won't win matches for my team. It is more important to play an outstanding innings to win my team games. I go behind that kind of idea," he explained.

Coming to the next most important aspect — keeping wickets. Samson says that he has never shied away from the responsibility and it is the team management which makes those calls.
"I have been keeping wickets

in white-ball cricket for Kerala for the last five or six years and have also kept in the Ranji Trophy for-mat. I keep that as an open thing. Whatever my team requires, I do it accordingly. In the IPL, whenever my team wanted me to keep I did. But they at time felt I could contribute more on the field, so I did that. I prepare for myself both as a keeper and fielder because you never know what the team is looking at," he pointed.

his poor work with the gloves.
However, the team management and selectors continue to back him. Rohit Sharma even urged his critics to leave him alone and let him play with freedom while the legendary Sunil Gavaskar says pressure is bound to be there when one is playing for India.

"I agree with the both the versions of Rohit and Sunny sir. Rishabh is going through a bit of rough period. He needs a couple of good knocks that can bring him back to his best. I had a discussion with the team management on this and they said that they are seriously working on him to bring him back to his best," Prasad, who is nearing the end of his term, said.

"With regard to the point raised regarding pressure, Rishabh should definitely realise that pressure is part of this game at this level and the one who comes out of this pressure is a true champion. He has live examples in front of him in Virat and Rohit."

Prasad, who was appointed as the selection committee chief in 2016, said Pant should never try to fill Dhoni's big boots.
"Rishabh should also realise

that he has his own identity and he should never compare himself with MSD which I feel is working on his mind. MSD has built his career and image playing for over a decade and half. His confidence stems from his stellar performances both at domes-tic and International levels.

"Suddenly when one starts com-paring himself with that legend, then subconsciously you are putting



enormous pressure on yourself. Personally I feel Rishabh is an unbelievable talent and he should believe and back his abilities and instincts rather than stepping into someone else's shoes," added the 44-year-old former India wicketkeeper-batsman who played six Tests and 17 ODIs.
