# Cong wins Raj trust

## Gehlot mocks BJP for abortive bid to topple his Govt

PNS ■ NEW DELHI/JAIPUR

The Ashok Gehlot dispensation won the confidence motion by a voice vote in the Rajasthan Assembly on Friday, ending the threat to its existence triggered by a rebellion within the Congress ranks in the State led by his former deputy Sachin Pilot.

The motion of confidence moved by Rajasthan Parliamentary Affairs Minister Shanti Dhariwal was passed by voice vote, an expected win after the return of the 19 dissident Congress MLAs led by Pilot to the party-fold.

Replying to the debate on the motion, Gehlot criticised the BJP, accusing it again of trying to bring down his Government. "I will not let the Government topple at any cost even if you make all attempts," he said.

Gehlot said the crisis had come to an end in a beautiful manner and this had hurt the BJP. "What was done in Arunachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Goa, Madhya Pradesh? Elected Governments are being toppled and democracy is under danger," he said, accusing the BJP of targeting the Congress Governments.

Without taking names, he alleged that a Union Minister was involved in the conspiracy to topple his Government, saying this had become clear after some audio clips surfaced.

The indirect reference was to Jagendra Singh Shekhawat, who had earlier rejected the Congress allegation.

Gehlot also questioned



whether agencies like ED, CBI and Income Tax department are not being misused in the country? "When you hold conversation on telephone, don't you say the other person to join you on Facebook and WhatsApp. Is this good thing in a democracy?" the CM said.

Gehlot also took potshots on the role of Governor with whom he and his party had to struggle to call the Special Session as the Raj Bhavan was reluctant.

"The post of the Governor has lost its dignity. Don't provoke me or else I will be forced to share what transpired between the Governor and me. I think the Governor was under pressure. Hundered editorials have been written about the situation in the State after the Governor returned the file on the State Government's wish to convene an Assembly session.

The job of the Governor is no more than asking to prove majority in the House," Gehlot said in the Assembly. Using his speech during

accused the Gehlot camp of blaming it for the infighting within the Congress.

Targeting the Chief Minister for his comments against his now sacked deputy, Leader of Opposition Gulab Chand Kataria questioned how Pilot became useless after the formation of the Government when he had strengthened the party while in Opposition.

### I am the strongest warrior of Cong, avows Sachin Pilot

Hitting out at the Opposition over its criticism of the recent political developments in Rajasthan, former Deputy Chief Minister Sachin Pilot on Friday described himself as the "strongest warrior" of the Congress and said he would protect his party at all costs.

Pilot, who has returned to the Congress fold after a month-long rebellion against Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot, made the remarks during the debate on a motion of confidence in the Assembly.

During the debate, Deputy Leader of the Opposition Rajendra Rathore mentioned Pilot's name in various matters, including the recent political developments in the State and a Special Operations Group (SOG) notice issued to him.

# Covid 2.5 mn and counting

## 5.50L cases in past 10 days in India; Health Joint Secy Luv Agarwal tests +ve

With over 60,000 cases daily for the past few days, India coronavirus count crossed 2.5 million mark on Friday. For the last 10 days, the country has witnessed a huge surge, adding 5.50 lakh fresh cases during this period. India now accounts for 10.35 per cent of all active cases globally (one in every 10 active cases), and 6.21% of all deaths (one in every 16).

Overall, five States with the biggest 24-hour jump in total cases are Maharashtra (12,608), Andhra Pradesh (8,943), Karnataka (7,908), Tamil Nadu (5,890) and Uttar Pradesh (4,512).

Meanwhile, the face of India's Covid-19 fight, Luv Agarwal, joint secretary of the Health Ministry, has also tested coronavirus positive.

"Dear All, just to inform that I have tested positive for Covid-19 and initiating home isolation as per guidelines. Requesting all my friends, colleagues for self monitoring. Contact tracing will be done by health team. Hoping to see everyone soon," he tweeted.

The condition of noted singer Balasubrahmanyam deteriorated and based on the advice of expert medical team attending to him, he has been moved to ICU and he is on life support and his condition remains critical.

According to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, India conducted record 8,48,728 tests for detection of

coronavirus in a day with an aim to achieve a daily target of 10 lakh and recovery rate rose to 71.17 per cent. The fatality rate has declined to 1.95 per cent. Union Health Minister Dr Harsh Vardhan claimed the recovery rate of Covid-19 patients in India is the best in the world.

Maharashtra reported 12608 fresh cases and 364 deaths in the last 24 hours, taking the total tally to 5,72,734 including 19,427 deaths. Nagpur district of Maharashtra recorded its highest single-day spike of over 1,000 coronavirus cases in the last 24 hours. Mumbai has reported 979 new infections and 47 deaths, taking the total tally to 1,28,550 and 7,035 deaths so far. The coronavirus case tally in the

# J&K Police scoops 2nd highest peacetime gallantry medal

## ITBP recommends gallantry medals for 21 jawans who fought PLA troops

The Jammu & Kashmir Police has bagged the Kirti Chakra, the second highest peacetime gallantry medal that comes after the Ashok Chakra on the eve of 74th Independence Day and also earned a Shaurya Chakra, the third highest in precedence in the category. The J&K Police also topped the list of winners of Police Medals for Gallantry (PMG) by bagging 81 medals.

The CRPF follows the J&K Police with 51 medals, mostly for operations conducted in Jammu & Kashmir.

While the Kirti Chakra was awarded posthumously to Head Constable of Jammu & Kashmir Police Abdul Rashid Kalas, the Shaurya Chakra went to Deputy Inspector General of the J&K Police Amit Kumar.

The Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) on Friday has



recommended gallantry medals to 21 troops who fought against China's People Liberation Army (PLA) in Eastern Ladakh in May-June, for this year's Independence Day.

The ITBP has accorded 294 commendation rolls and insignias to the paramilitary personnel for "displaying raw courage and bravery during face-offs and skirmishes in Eastern Ladakh in May-June, 2020," on the eve of the national festival.

"The ITBP troops not only effectively used shields to protect themselves but also responded fiercely to PLA advancing troops and brought

the situation under control. With the highest order of professional skills, ITBP troops fought shoulder to shoulder and also brought the injured Indian Army troops to the rear," the ITBP said in a statement highlighting the bravery against the treachery of the PLA troops.

It further said, "Even when the ITBP troops fought the whole night, they received minimum casualties by giving befitting reply to the stone pelters of the PLA. At places, they gave a determined stand-off about 17 to 20 hours throughout the intervening nights."

# SC holds Prashant Bhushan guilty of contempt of court

The Supreme Court on Friday held activist-lawyer Prashant Bhushan guilty of criminal contempt for his two derogatory tweets against the judiciary saying they cannot be said to be a fair criticism of the functioning of the judiciary in the public interest.

Holding that Bhushan attempted to scandalise the entire institution of the Supreme Court, the SC said: "If such an attack is not dealt with, with requisite degree of firmness, it may affect the national honour."

# Don't exceed your brief on sealing in Delhi, SC warns monitoring panel

Encroachment is a matter of concern but the monitoring committee, set up in 2006 to identify unauthorised structures and check misuse of residential properties in Delhi, "cannot exceed its power" and take any action beyond its authorisation, the Supreme Court said on Friday.

A bench headed by Justice Arun Mishra said at no point of time, the SC has empowered the monitoring committee to take action with regard to "residential premises not used for commercial purpose" and it is not authorised to take action concerning residential premises

situated on private land.

The SC said this in its verdict in which it dealt with the authority of monitoring committee to seal residential premises on private land, when they are not being used for commercial purpose.

It directed the properties, sealed as per the committee's April last year report, be de-sealed and possession be restored to the owners. "Let this order be complied with within three days. However, we clarify that this order does not at all mean to belittle the yeomen service done by the monitoring committee for protection of Delhi," it said.

# Ramp up testing, increase beds in Covid hosps: CM

PNS ■ LUCKNOW

Directing officials to make all efforts to further ramp up COVID-19 testing, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said it was a matter of satisfaction that Uttar Pradesh had become the state which had conducted the maximum 36 lakh tests so far in the country.

Presiding over a high-level unlock review meeting at his official residence here on Friday, the chief minister said that the Integrated Command and Control Centre (ICCC) should be kept fully functional.

He also asked officials to increase the number of beds in Level-2 and Level-3 Covid hospitals while ensuring arrangements of medical equipment and human resources.

The chief minister directed the officials to exercise special caution in the districts of Lucknow, Kanpur Nagar, Prayagraj, Gorakhpur, Varanasi and Bareilly to make health services better. He also asked the district administration to commission a 300-bed dedicated Covid hospital in Bareilly at the earliest.

Asking health officials to provide prompt treatment to COVID-19 patients, the chief minister said they should be admitted to Level-1, Level-2 and Level-3 Covid hospitals according to their condition.

In a fresh directive, the chief minister said that the cen-



tres for competitive exams should be made in government schools and colleges only. He said social distancing protocol should be followed in these exam centres and all the staff made to wear masks compulsorily. He also directed officials concerned to ensure arrangement of sanitiser at the examination centres.

The chief minister also asked officials to ensure timely supply of relief material in the flood-hit areas.

He said compensation should be given in case of damage to house. He also directed officials to ensure adequate availability of urea.

## Uttar Pradesh pips TN to grab top spot in Covid tests

On the eve of Independence Day, Uttar Pradesh notched up the top spot in COVID-19 testing by conducting 35 lakh tests, beating Tamil Nadu.

This was confirmed by Director of Information, Shishir, who tweeted on Friday: "Today another milestone achieved. Uttar Pradesh now at No. 1 having done the maximum No. of tests. Cumulative figures reach 35,97,233. Samples tested yesterday 96,106"

Additional Chief Secretary (Health) Amit Mohan Prasad said that the average COVID-19 tests done daily in the last week stood at 90,000.

"It is a huge achievement as in March last, the state could only carry out around 100 COVID-19 tests daily. But within four months, the state machinery has turned the table and grabbed the top spot in coronavirus testing, leaving behind other states," he said.

After Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's stress on max-

imising testing across the state, officials geared up and for the first time on July 27, state labs tested 1.06 lakh samples. Besides, on August 2 and 8 too, the number of tests crossed the one lakh-mark. The highest tests on a single day were on August 2, when 1.14 lakh samples were tested. However, of these tests around 50 per cent were rapid antigen tests.

UP has emerged as the only state in the country to carry out one lakh tests daily which is well above the World Health Organisation norms for tests.

"As per WHO norms, there should be 140 tests for every 10 lakh population. As per the norm, UP should have at least 32,000 tests, instead, the number of tests being done in the state is three times more," the official claimed.

Prasad said that there were 50,426 active cases in the state while 92,526 patients had recovered, including 3,740 people discharged from Covid hospitals on Friday.

He said that at present there were 23,961 asympto-

matic patients in home isolation, 1,613 in private hospitals, 186 in semi-paid hotels and rest in government-run Covid hospitals. "Till date, 46,096 asymptomatic patients were in home isolation out of which 22,135 have recovered," he informed. The official also said that among positive cases, 70.22 per cent were males and 29.78 per cent females.

"Youths between 21 and 40 years are most affected and the percentage of positivity rate is 49.34 per cent. However, the positivity rate among people over 60 years of age is 8.34 per cent," he said.

Meanwhile, Additional Chief Secretary (Home) Awanish Awasthi said that beds in Covid hospitals in Lucknow, particularly in super-speciality SGPGI and KGMU, would be doubled by August end. He said all hospitals, including private ones, would increase beds in ICU and other wards for COVID-19 patients. Major hospitals like Medanta, Apollo and Sahara too will start Covid wards soon, he added.

## Sunni Waqf Board gears up for Ayodhya mosque

After bhoomi puja for construction of Ram temple at Ayodhya on August 5, Uttar Pradesh Sunni Central Waqf Board has started its effort to construct a mosque and other buildings at the five-acre land allotted to it in compliance with the Supreme Court order of November, 2019.

The Sunni Waqf Board has also set up the Indo Islamic Cultural Foundation (IICF) Trust to monitor the construction of the mosque in Ayodhya and has urged people to cooperate and help in the process.

The IICF Trust will open two bank accounts, one of which will be used for raising funds for mosque construction, while the other will be used for funding the building of a hospital and research centre on the campus.

Sunni Waqf Board spokesman Athar Hussain said on Friday that the IICF's new office would also be opened by

August 25. He said that a portal would also be launched to keep all details related to funds received online.

An IT company has been shortlisted for this and a domain has been allocated for the portal by the name of iicf.com.

In July, the UP Sunni Waqf Board had announced the formation of a trust with 15 members for mosque construction. Of them, nine members were declared and the remaining would be co-opted by these members.

Chairman of UP Sunni Waqf Board will be chief trustee and chairman of the new trust.

The trust members named include its president Zufar Ahmad Farooqui, vice-president Adnan Farrukh Shah, secretary Athar Husain, treasurer Faez Aftab and members Mohammad Junaid Siddiqui, Sheikh Sauduzzaman, Mohammad Rashid and Imran Ahmad.

## Gallantry Medal to Vijay Bhushan for fifth time

Inspector General (Police Recruitment and Promotional Board) Vijay Bhushan created a national record of sorts by being nominated for the President's Medal for Gallantry for a fifth time.

This is the highest amongst officers of Indian Police Services (IPS) cadre in the country. Bhushan's name figured in a list along with 23 other police officers/personnel from Uttar Pradesh to be awarded the prestigious award on the eve of Independence Day.

As per the list issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs on Friday, late constable Eknath Yadav and ASP Rajesh Sahni, both from UP Police, were selected for Police Medal for Gallantry posthumously.

Sahni, an outstanding officer posted with Anti-Terrorists Squad (ATS) ended his life in the ATS office under mysterious circumstances.

Besides Bhushan, the other recipients are SP Barabanki, Dr Arvind Chaturvedi, ADG (Law and Order) Prashant Kumar, ADG (Dial 112) Asim Arun, Secretary



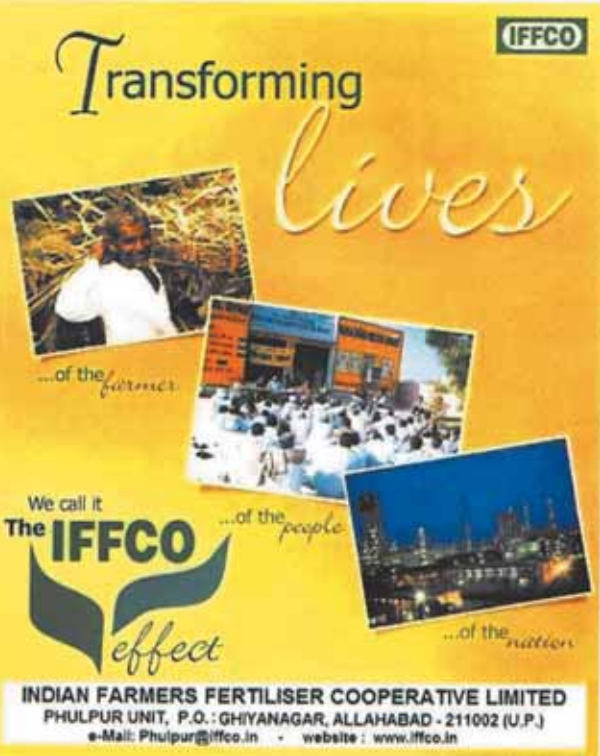
(Home) SK Bhagat, SSP Muzaffarnagar Abhishek Yadav, SSP Meerut Ajay Kumar Sahani and SP Satpal. Those selected for

President's Gallantry Medal are constables Lokesh Bhati, Avdresh Singh, Athar Ahmed, Avinash Kumar, Vikas Yadav, Mahendra Pal, Fayeem Miya and Vineet Kumar Kapasiya, sub-inspectors Amit Kumar, Praveesh Kumar, Ajay Kumar and Dhananjay Mishra and ASP Narendra Pratap Singh.

Interestingly, Vijay Bhushan, SK Bhagat, Dr Arvind Chaturvedi and Dhananjay Mishra were feted for gunning down a criminal, Firdaus aka Mota aka Javed aka Rajesh Kumar Singh, in 2006. He was involved in the murder of BJP MLA Krishnanand Rai in November, 2005.

Dr Arvind Chaturvedi, awarded the first bar (second medal) to Police Medal for Gallantry, said that he and others awarded medals were posted in STF when the encounter took place at Link Road in Malad area of Mumbai on April 19, 2006.

Firdaus extorted money from coal traders from Kolkata to Mughalsarai, was a hitman of Mukhtar Ansari gang of UP and was accused in numerous criminal cases, including the elimination of Krishnanand Rai.

## Nishad Party MLA Vijay Mishra held in Sagar

**Lucknow (PNS):** Booked on charges of grabbing property and intimidation, criminal-turned-politico Vijay Mishra was arrested from Sagar in Madhya Pradesh on Friday.

Mishra is a Nishad Party MLA from Gyanpur in Bhadohi. Superintendent of Police of Bhadohi, Ram Badan Singh, told media persons that Mishra was arrested by MP police on a tip-off provided by Bhadohi police.

He said that a police team was later sent to Sagar to bring the MLA to Bhadohi on transit remand.

Interestingly, on Thursday, Mishra posted a video on social media claiming that he and his family would be eliminated in some alleged encounter just because he was a Brahmin.

His wife Ramlali Mishra is an MLC from Mirzapur-Sonbhadra and went missing on Thursday evening. On Friday, her police gunner Ishwar Chand reported her disappearance at Georgetown police station in Prayagraj.

Only on Thursday, Ramlali had written to Union Home Minister Amit Shah, apprehending threat to her husband's life and that of other family members. She also demanded that all cases registered against them be probed either by CB CID or a competent agency.

On August 9, Vijay Mishra, his wife Ramlali and their son Vishnu were booked on a complaint filed by a relative, Krishna Mohan Tiwari, at Gopiganj police station on Friday. The complainant was also provided police security perceiving threat to his life.

# More high-flow nasal cannula, ventilators, HDU beds in hosps

PNS ■ LUCKNOW

Divisional Commissioner Mukesh Meshram said on Friday that with the majority of patients in Lucknow in home isolation, the number of critical patients in the hospitals had increased and thus the number of high-flow nasal cannula, ventilators and HDU beds in Covid hospitals were being increased. He said private hospitals like Medanta and Apollo had also been roped in for Covid-19 patients.

Experts had termed the high-flow nasal cannula very effective and ventilator the last resort. The Divisional Commissioner said they were having no problems with ambulance management.

CMO Dr Rajendra Prasad Singh insisted that though the number of coronavirus cases had increased, there was still no community transmission in the district. "It is a small percentage of people who have got the coronavirus infection in the district," he said.

The CMO said they had also been shuffling he staff for better management and containment of the virus. He said though the coronavirus graph was going up and down in the district, better results would follow after a week when a large number of people would have taken Ivermectin tablets.

The CMO office also released per-day rates for private hospitals. For those who are moderately sick, the isolation beds, including the supportive care and oxygen, will cost Rs 10,000 which includes the cost of PPE at Rs 1,200. For severe sickness which includes ICU without ventilator care, the cost will be Rs 15,000, including the cost of PPE at Rs 2,000. In case of very severe sickness requiring ICU bed with ventilator care, including the cost of PPE at Rs 2,000, the cost of the treatment will be Rs



18,000. The CMO said three copies of the medical bills would be taken out and one would be sent to the CMO office. "If there is special treatment for which the patient has been charged, specific mention should be made in the bill," he added.

Meanwhile, in a meeting with the district administration officials, District Magistrate Abhishek Prakash said that private labs carrying out Covid testing for a private hospital had to first sign an MoU with that hospital and send a copy of the same to the CMO office.

The DM said that from August 14 onwards, private hospitals had to upload the bed status after every four hours, make parking areas for the ambulances and put signages for the same. He said that private hospitals would not give admission to patients from other districts without taking medical consultation and informing the Integrated Control and Command Centre.

The DM was informed that one of the government hospitals was not feeding the data of beds properly. He directed the district surveil-

lance officer to appoint two persons to ensure regular flow of data from the hospital.

Meanwhile, drug inspector Brijesh Pathak said that sales of Ivermectin tablets had shot up by 65 per cent. "People have been using this as a prophylactic since the time a Bangladeshi doctor had announced that this medicine could be used for the control of virus. There has also been a government order to this effect lately. It has been observed that if anyone tests positive for coronavirus and their family members are given this medicine, they do not get the infection," he said.

Director of Civil and Lok Bandhu hospitals Dr Madhu Saxena said they had been currently working on containment of the spread of coronavirus virus in their own staff since a number of them had tested positive. "I have made a few changes to help protect the staff from coronavirus infection since a large number of the general public are getting themselves tested. The testing which used to take place at many points at the hospital has been restricted to one area. The number of staff coming to the

hospital has also been restricted because their unnecessary movement was causing the spread of infection. Directions have been given to the staff to get themselves tested and have a prophylactic medicine," she said.

## VPIMS TO TREAT COVID-19 PATIENTS

Vivekanand Polyclinic and Institute of Medical Sciences will also be providing treatment to Covid-19 patients. CMO Dr Rajendra Prasad Singh confirmed that the process to start Covid facility at the hospital was on. PRO of the institute Dr Vishal Kumar Singh said they would be taking in L-1, L-2 and L-3 patients. He said that the institute had written to the district administration that it was ready to accommodate as many as 60 Covid-19 patients requiring critical care, including four beds with dialysis facilities besides 30 beds for L-1 and L-2 patients. "We have 12 ventilators, five BiPAPs and other infrastructure to provide treatment to Covid-19 patients. Also, the shifts of doctors will also be communicated to the administration," he said.

## 652 more test +ve in city

As many as 652 more persons tested positive for coronavirus while five succumbed to Covid-19, including four from Lucknow. Besides, 504 persons recovered, taking the number of recovered patients in Lucknow to 8,607. The number of deaths in the city stands at 186 while that of active cases is 7,188.

A senior official at the CMO office said those who tested positive included 35 from Alambagh, 29 from Bazaarkhala, 27 from Indiranagar, 25 each from Talkatora & Mahanagar, 22 from Hazratganj, 21 from Jankipuram, 20 from Madaion, 19 from Chowk, 17 from Gomtinagar, 15 from Saadatganj, 14 from Thakurganj, 13 from Chinhat, 10 each from Kaiserbagh & Vikasnagar, 11 from Rae Bareilly road, 15 each from Cantt & Naka, nine each from Ashiyana & Sushant Golf City, eight from Gudamba, seven each from Sarojininagar & Kakori, four from Aminabad and three from Hasanganj.

The official said that there was one death each in RML Hospital, Vidya Hospital and KGMU. Meanwhile, in the state, 4,600 persons tested positive for coronavirus, including 289 from Kanpur, 142 from Ghaziabad, 162 from Varanasi and 213 from Prayagraj, taking the total number of cases to 1,45,287. There were 59 deaths in the state, included four each from Kanpur, Gorakhpur, Bareilly, three each from Varanasi, Prayagraj and Moradabad.

# Two groups clash at toll tax plaza

Two groups of youths had a clash at a toll tax plaza on Agra Expressway in Kakori, giving police a tough task on Thursday night. Youths in one of the groups were accused of opening fire with an intention to kill. They accused their rival of acting fresh with a woman on their side.

The firing incident created a sensation in the locality and the toll tax plaza staff called the police, who reached the scene for investigation. The area was soon filled with a huge number of police personnel.

As per reports, a resident of Madaion, along with his wife and gunner, was going to Noida via the expressway and had a verbal spat with a Mainpuri resident, Anil Kumar, and his friend Shani, also of Mainpuri. Anil and Shani were coming to Lucknow by a car.

The Madaion resident alleged that Anil and Shani started passing lewd remarks on his wife and so he confronted them. "The Madaion resident claimed that he opened fire as Anil and Shani were acting fresh with his wife," Madaion SHO Pramendar Singh said. He said Anil and Shani accused the Madaion resident of opening fire with an intention to kill him.

"We registered a case for eve-teasing against Anil and Shani and arrested both. We

also registered a case of murderous assault and arrested him and his gunner/driver," the SHO said. A police spokesman said a case for reckless driving, thrashing, abusing and for murderous assault (under sections 279/323/504/506/307 of IPC) was registered against the Madaion resident and his aide and both were arrested from Durgaganj crossing in Kakori around 8:30 am on Friday. He said a licenced rifle and two live cartridges were recovered from their possession. The spokesman further said a case under sections 279/504/506/354 of IPC was registered against Anil and Shani, both of Mainpuri, and both were arrested.

## SELF-IMMOLATION

Suffering from some disease, a girl student pursuing PG immolated herself at her house in Madaion on Thursday evening. As per reports, the girl, identified as Hema Bajpai (22), was pursuing her studies from IGNOU and was under treatment for some neuro problem for the last four years. Her brother Raja told mediapersons that Hema was under depression due to the disease. "She locked herself inside a room and later set herself on fire. We broke open the doors but she had suffered severe burns. We rushed her to Civil Hospital where she was declared brought dead," he said.

# Mystery shrouds death of missing retired banker

Mystery has shrouded the death of a missing retired banker, whose body was recovered from a service lane in Gudamba on Friday. As per reports, some residents of Kursi road spotted a man lying dead in the service lane and alerted the police. The police ascertained the identity of the deceased as Bhudhar Lal (64) of Jankipuram (Sector-H).

Sharing details of investigation into the case, the police said deceased's son Manish Chaudhary identified the body after reaching the scene. "Bhudhar was in the habit of consuming alcohol and he used to return home either late in the night or even the next day," Manish was quoted as saying by the police. Manish said his father died of excessive alcohol consumption. His father retired as bank manager. The police said the body was recovered from near a desi liquor shop.

Meanwhile, a 14-year-old girl died after she fell down after being chased by monkeys in PGI police station area on Thursday evening. As per reports, the girl, identified as Saloni of Brahmin Tola in the locality, was playing with other children on the terrace of her house. All of a sudden, a group of monkeys reached there and

As per reports, some devotees saw the body in the pond and alerted the mela committee of the temple. The committee members later called the police. As villagers could not identify the deceased, the police sent the body to morgue and started further investigation.

# Smart meters working on obsolete technology

Delay in upgradation of communication technology for managing the network of electricity smart meters and servers by the UP Power Corporation Limited is said to be the root cause of the simultaneous tripping of nearly five lakh meters at the consumer end on Wednesday. The communication network linking the smart meters with the server installed at Shakti Bhawan, the UPPCL headquarters, is still working on 2G technology even as the Centre is in the process of rolling out the 5G technology.

Sources in UPPCL said for making the system foolproof, all the smart meters would have to replace compliant with the latest technology. "The signs of trouble were visible for over a year, either in the form of meter jumping or meters registering excess power consumption and some other faults. The simultaneous tripping of five lakh meters is the most alarming situation which needs to be tackled without any further loss of time," an

official said. He said the power consumers forum had filed a petition before UP Electricity Regulatory Commission in April 2019, complaining about the installation of the smart meters with obsolete technology. He said the power regulator had issued notice to the UPPCL, seeking a reply but no action had been taken by the power corporation in last over one year.

"If the smart meters are not replaced immediately and there is yet another tripping of meters it can lead to the collapse of the northern power grid due to sudden drop in demand for electricity," UP Power Consumer Forum Chairman Avadesh Verma said. The power consumer forum alleged that the UPPCL was waiting for another disaster for replacing the smart meters. Verma said the UPPCL had given contract for purchase of 40 lakh smart meters at a cost of Rs 1,927 crore. He said 2G and 3G was an obsolete technology and the UPPCL should have opted either for 4G or equivalent NB-IOT (narrow band internet of things) com-

munication technology. Energy Efficiency Services (EESL), a joint venture of four public sector enterprises under the Union Ministry for Power, had announced in April 2019 about installation of over five lakh smart meters across the country. Among the states, Uttar Pradesh topped with over four lakh smart meter installations in 13 cities — Lucknow, Kanpur, Varanasi, Allahabad, Gorakhpur, Meerut, Moradabad, Aligarh, Saharanpur, Jhansi, Mathura, Bareilly and Ayodhya.

Smart meters have also been installed in Delhi, Bihar and Andhra Pradesh, under the Centre's Smart Meter National Programme (SMNP). EESL had signed a MoU with the UPPCL in April 2019 to replace 40 lakh conventional electricity meters with smart ones within three years with the twin objectives to enable customers to check and optimise their consumption pattern in real time with minimal manual intervention and help discoms control power theft, improve billing efficiency and reduction in AT&C losses.



# 10-year-old raped, killed in Sambhal

Sexual offences continued To rock the state when in Sambhal a 10-year-old girl was raped and murdered on Thursday. Besides, a man and his son were killed in Azamgarh while a youth was murdered for objecting to harassment of his sister in Etah.

In Sambhal, a minor girl of Chandasi area was playing outside her house on Thursday evening after which she disappeared. After searching for

her, her kin informed the local police. Later on Thursday night, some locals spotted a man carrying a gunny bag. When they stopped him and searched his bag, they were shocked to find the body of the missing girl. They beat up the man and handed him over to the police.

During quizzing, the accused admitted to having raped the girl and later strangled her fearing being identified. A case was registered and the body was sent for autopsy.

In nearby Etah, Faizan of Jawaharpur hamlet of Piluwa used to tease a neighbour Haseen's sister after which the family members complained to the miscreant's parents. Irked

over the complaint, Faizan barged into Haseen's house on Thursday night, abused the kin and later opened fire, killing Haseen on the spot. A case was registered and

a hunt was launched for the absconding accused.

In Azamgarh, Mithai Yadav of Rasoolpur Duddhar in Devgaon was strolling with his son Tez Yadav when unidentified miscreants opened fire on Thursday night. While Mithai died on the spot, his son succumbed to his injuries in a community health centre. Senior police officers rushed to the spot and suspected political rivalry to be the motive behind the attack. A case was registered and investigations were on.

## CISH developing solar light traps for pest management

PNS ■ LUCKNOW

Solar light traps are being developed at CISH (Central Institute for Subtropical Horticulture) for pest management, especially for orchards.

CISH director Shailendra Rajan said that in view of the current emphasis on non-chemical and environment-friendly options for managing crop pests, solar light traps can be termed appropriate technology. Principal scientist at CISH HS Singh said there are two sources of energy in these traps.

“One is electricity and another is solar light. The prevailing electric-based light traps in the market need to charge the battery on a daily basis; many a time there is no electricity and many farmers

do have domestic electricity but not at their farms. The institute has given emphasis on solar light-based traps as they have added advantage of very little or no maintenance and ease of carrying and installation,” he said.

He added that most traps have insect collection trays with water or glue boards which need to be emptied daily or the glue board replaced regularly. “The institute has provisioned an instant insect killing system in the trap design which does not need daily emptying of the insect collection tray. Most solar light-based traps do not have an auto switch on/off mechanism. The present prototype works during active periods of pest abundance, say up to 12 nights, afterwards it gets switched off which prevents

the beneficial insect from attraction and death in the trap. The trap also has an auto start mechanism on sunsets and gets switched off in case there is rain or heavy wetting to avoid short-circuiting. The trap has dual wavelength bulbs which get switched on and off at defined intervals to attract pests of different orders,” he added.

Head of Plant Protection HS Singh has developed various models of such trap prototypes which are under evaluation. “The trap attracts borers, leaf folder, white grub, beetles, leaf webber, semi-loopers, cutworm, DBM, leaf miner, hairy caterpillar and many other insect pests. Once perfected, these traps will be available shortly for farmers in the region,” CISH director Shailendra Rajan said.

# 135 COVID-19 patients found

PIIONEER NEWS SERVICE ■ VARANASI

As many as 135 new COVID-19 patients have been found in the district here on Friday. With this, the total number of cases has reached 5,267. The district also saw two more deaths increasing the toll to 96. During the day, the follow-up negative reports included 106 patients recovered from home isolation and the total number of patients cured at home has increased to 1,943 while 44 recovered from the hospitals. With this, the total number of patients discharged from the hospitals has reached 1,689 while the total number of cured patients is 3,632 leaving 1,539 active patients.

Meanwhile, Union Skill Development Minister Mahendra Nath Pandey and Union Minister of State for Health and Family Welfare Ashwini Kumar Choubey jointly flagged off the mobile lab-bike (Dhanwantari Chaland Hospital) for Varanasi through a virtual programme. On-the-spot mobile lab-bikes will provide 76 types of blood screening and telemedicine facilities by roaming in villages and cities. Corona will play an important role in providing medical counselling to people in the transition period. It has been launched under an authorized pilot project from ICMR. Earlier, this facility has been launched recently in Bhalagapur and Buxar. It is seeing positive results. Arit Chaubey conducted the programme.

On the eve of Independence Day, the security forces launched a massive checking drive at different places and in this direction, passengers were searched at Varanasi Junction (Cantt.) railway station. The passengers were also checked at Cantt bus depot. The premises of Roadways were also searched with metal detectors and sniffer dogs. Besides, the security arrangements at Lal Bahadur Shastri International Airport, Babatpur and leading temples including Kashi Vishwanath Mandir and others have also been intensified though due to corona pandemic, the day would not be celebrated in a grand manner.

At Diesel Locomotive Works (DLW), a massive cleanliness drive was launched under ongoing cleanliness

week. During the day, the officers and employees offered their 'Shramdaan' at Surya Sarovar, Pachhimi Bazar and Jalalipatti under the leadership of chief security officer and coordinator Mahesh Kumar. The national flag will be hoisted on Saturday at 9 am at Administrative Building by Principal Chief Electrical Engineer (PCEE) SK Kashyap. According to the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) Dr VB Singh, in the first report received by 11 am during the day, as many as 59 new corona patients were found out of 2,159 reports received from Microbiology department of Banaras Hindu University (BHU). Till then, the total test reports received were 68,636 and the results of 4,575 including 858 RTPCR samples collected a day ago are awaited.

Out of these, 63,445 were negative reports while 5,191 positive. The total number of samples collected was 74,069. Earlier, among the two deaths one male aged 49 from Lakhi Chautra (Chowk) died at Sir Sundarlal Hospital (SSH) in BHU, while a female aged 72 from Chowk died at Apex Hospital. With the addition of 13 red zones, the total number of hotspots has increased to 1,172 including 332 red zones. As many as two green zones have been converted into red zones again. Besides, there are 840 green zones including 12 new ones.

Earlier, this region of Purvanchal (eastern UP) comprising 10 districts of three divisions continued finding a large number of corona patients when 546 cases were detected on Thursday. Sonbhadra has become the eight district crossed the four-figure mark. For the second continuous day, the maximum number cases (138) were found in Ballia (2,755), followed by 129 in Varanasi (5,132), 50 in Azamgarh (1,990), 41 in Ghazipur (1,801), 40 in Mau (813), 38 in Chandauli (1,253), 36 in Mirzapur (1,218), 35 in Jaunpur (2,885), 31 in Sonbhadra (1,030) and eight in Bhadohi (788). Out of total 19,661 corona positive cases, 12,788 have been cured either at home isolation or discharged from hospitals and the recovery rate has increased to 65.04 per cent. However, the mortality rate remained at 1.36 per cent with the death toll to 268.

Coronavirus infection is spreading rapidly in Prayagraj. While the number of patients is increasing, the number of deaths continues daily. Due to the increase in the number of patients, now more than 200 positive cases are being reported every day. As of late Thursday night, a single day highest spike of 245 positive cases of COVID-19 have been detected in the Prayagraj, while three infected patients have also died at the SRN Hospital. A total of 4942 cases of corona have been reported so far while the death toll has surged to 88. Similarly, 81 patients were discharged from hospital after recovering while the report of 1392 samples were negative.

The three people who died due to coronavirus included an advocate of the Allahabad High Court, who is a resident of Mumfordganj. On August 8, when his report came positive, he was admitted to Covid Hospital SRN of L3. His treatment was underway but the condition remained critical. He was placed on a ventilator. He died on the fifth day. Doctors said that the advocate was suffering from BP and sugar disease.



Similarly, an 80-year-old woman also died who was corona infected. She was a resident of Colonelganj. On August 10, she was admitted to the Corona ward of SRN. A 37-year-old infected patient from Nihalpur also died from corona. He died at home. He was also suffering from other diseases.

Apart from this, two more patients died in SRN Hospital, one deceased belonged to Mirzapur and the other was a resident of Kaushambi district. These people also had many other diseases earlier.

Meanwhile, there are also some private hospitals in the corona transition period, which are not following the government guidelines at all. The Health department team conducted inspections in about

half-a-dozen clinics and private hospitals in the district. During this, two hospitals were sealed due to showing negligence. At the same time, six hospitals have been issued notices for not following the infection prevention protocol and physical distancing.

The team of Health department had reached to inspect Sangeeta Clinic Jhirjiri Road and Amit Clinic in Handia. It was found that it is registered in the name of a clinic in the CMO office but is being operated as a hospital. Hence, the clinic was sealed.

Prior to this, Anand Hospital, Asha Hospital Rajapur, Sharda Hospital, Bairahna and United Diagnostic Centre Civil Lines and Shah Memorial Hospital Saidabad, Yash Raj Hospital

Babuganj and Adarsh Hospital Phulpur in rural areas were also inspected.

CMO Dr GS Bajpai said that during inspection it was found that all these were not following the instructions issued by the government. Notices were issued to all these hospitals and a clarification has been sought in three days after improvement.

Many health workers and policemen have also been found infected among the corona positive patients who were found late on Thursday night. It also included a retired Principal of CMP Degree College and Senior Electrical Engineer of Railways.

According to Dr. Rishi Sahai, the Nodal Officer and district surveillance officer of COVID-19, there is a police officer of Dhumanganj police station, three employees of IFFCO and a chief technician among those found infected with coronavirus infection. Apart from this, the staff nurses of District Women's Hospital, RPF personnel, DRM office staff, Beli Hospital and Asha workers of Bahadurganj health centre, AG office and UPPSC staff, Sanskrit college teachers, employees of Anand Hospital have also been found corona positive, added Dr Sahai.

## RRTs identify 4,347 symptomatic persons

The Rapid Response Teams (RRTs) led by superintendents and medical officer-incharges of all the urban and rural areas of the district have intensified their efforts to make contact with positive patients at home isolation and if they need it necessary then recommend the patients to be shifted to the hospitals. Besides, the drive to trace the persons with contact history has also intensified by the surveillance teams in which the teachers are also involved. During the drive, 1.20 lakh ivermectin tablets were already distributed to 15,000 people in the district through the Health department as well as various other departments like supply and civil defence. Apart from the same sampling and corona investigation of 1,594 persons were done in the district on Thursday.

A total of 982 teams

including 782 in rural and 200 in urban areas are working in the district. During the campaign, the teams found 2,716 persons with symptoms like corona in rural areas while they have surveyed over 32.22 lakh people living in 6.36 lakh houses while in urban areas 1,631 people were detected during survey of over 10.25 lakh people living in 2.24 lakh homes. In all, a total of 4,347 symptomatic persons have been identified so far in the rural and urban areas by survey teams and their sampling is being done on a daily basis.

Meanwhile, District Magistrate (DM) Kaushal Raj Sharma assured that there would neither be any shortage of human nor of other medical resources at any level and with the cooperation of all, every effort will be made to control the corona infection soon. He further said that the difficulties being faced during the fight against COVID-19 would be

removed soon. According to him, additional human resources are being deployed in these tasks by monitoring the data feedings of sampling, contact tracing, surveillance and hospital facility and in this direction, the human resources of various departments including Revenue, Supply, Education, Municipal Corporation, Panchayat Raj, ICDS and Civil Defence are being used. Along with this, various other resources under COVID-19 are being continuously increased by negotiating at the state level and higher levels.

He further said that it is a constant effort of the district administration that alongs with proper utilisation of departmental human resources available in the district, other resources should also be increased. The participation of L-1 and L-2 hospitals in the government and private sectors has also been ensured. In

recent times, for the convenience of serious and emergency patients visiting private hospitals, they have been provided antigen kits for free corona examinations. Additional beds were increased in L-3 level BHU Hospital, which now increased to 190, and two machines of high flow heated respiratory humidifiers were made available to BHU Hospital by Divisional Commissioner (DC) Deepak Agrawal which will help in treating ICU patients. Similarly, two machines of high flow heated respiratory humidifiers have been made available in L-2 Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay (DDU) Hospital by Indian Red-Cross Society. Steam vaporiser machines have also been provided for patients admitted to hospitals. Covid-treated plasma donors have been identified and now BHU has also started plasma therapy treatment in the district.

# BHU, CSIR-NISTADS ink MoU

Addressing the programme, Dr Neeraj Tripathi said that the MoU will open new avenues for university students and researchers.

Speaking at the occasion, Prof AK Tripathi, Director, Institute of Science, BHU, said that CSIR-NISTADS can play an important role in exposing university students to CSIR technologies. Prof AS Raghuvanshi, Director, Institute of Environment and Sustainable Development and Prof SK Dubey, Director, Institute of Management Studies, also spoke on possible areas of collaboration between

the two institutions.

Prof Raghuvanshi was of the view that BHU offers a massive infrastructure which may be used for CSIR technologies before exposing them to the industry or concerned stakeholders. This will benefit the scientists, researchers and students at BHU. Prof Dubey highlighted how Institute of Management Studies is contributing to government projects and evaluating many of them. He added that there are several areas where CSIR-NISTADS – BHU collaboration can be of greater impact. Prof Vivek Singh, coordinator, Computer Centre, BHU, said that BHU and CSIR-NISTADS can work together in setting up a joint centre for quantitative science studies. He added that there are many other areas

where the two institutions can join hands and make a difference.

Highlighting the areas in which CSIR-NISTADS is providing its expertise, Dr Ranjana Agarwal, emphasised the policy-oriented focus of NISTADS and said that NISTADS has executed several such projects for government and international agencies. She said that the institute has a very unique library which will be of great use for students and faculty members of BHU. She said that the CSIR-NISTADS can play a key role in taking CSIR technologies to the masses and this MoU is a way to facilitate it. Prof Sujit Bhattacharya, chief scientist, NISTADS and Dr Yogesh Suman, senior principal scientist, NISTADS were also present on the occasion.

## Ganga starts rising again in Varanasi

**VARANASI (PNS):** After remaining steady for a couple of days, the water level in river Ganga has started rising, once again. Though the river is still flowing far below the warning level, the situation may turn grim within a few days if the intensity of rising trend increases as it was seen several times in the recent past. During the last few years, the city and its adjoining areas had seen flood havoc several times and continuation of uptrend may pose possibilities of flood in low-lying areas. In this region of Purvanchal (eastern UP) several rivers like Ghagara and Sarju had already caused a lot of damages in some of the dis-

tricts including Ballia, Mau and Azamgarh.

In the city, as per the report of Middle Ganga Division-III of Central Water Commission (CWC), on Friday morning, though the river Ganga was constant at upstream Phaphamau, it has seen rising trend after Sangam (confluence of rivers Ganga, Yamuna and invisible Saraswati) in Prayagraj, indicating that the major water in the river is coming from Yamuna side because all the places, the river has seen rising trend, right from upstream Allahabad to downstream Ballia including Mirzapur, Varanasi and Ghazipur. This rising trend

also indicates the good intensity in the rising trend though as per record, during the last 24 hours, the water level was increased by 15 centimetres, means 0.5 cms per hour.

As the water level in river Gomti has also started rising both at upstream Sultanpur and Jaunpur and downstream Maighat, the heartbeats of residents of four villages in Daab area, about 25-30 kms from here, have started increasing because the area is surrounded by river Ganga and Gomti near its confluence at Kaithi. During the floods, the area often cut off all the links from the mainstream. In the city, the river was at 62.92 metres in the

morning against 70.26 metres warning level. Normally when the river level rises above 69-70 metres, the river Varuna starts reverse flow from its confluence at northern parts of the city. Due to rising trends, the water has already entered several low-lying temples at different ghats submerging the idols.

According to reports received from adjoining districts, the minister-in-charge of Ballia Anil Rajbhar has ordered for cancellation of all the leaves of the officers. He recently visited there and inspected the flood-affected areas in Ballia, which separates the state from Bihar and is surrounded by three major rivers.

Despite the non-regular academic session due to coronavirus infection, UP Madhyamik Shiksha Parishad i.e UP Board is all geared up to start the examination of High School and Intermediate from March 2021. This time examinations will not be conducted in the month of February due to corona crisis, because studies are not being regularised till now.

UP Board administration is also starting online education from August 18, students of various classes will have to watch Doordarshan's Swayamprabha channel for this. Apart from this, all competitions like sports will be held in schools, provided physical distance has to be complied with. Uttar Pradesh Madhyamik Shiksha Parishad has released the annual calendar of 2021 so that the examinations of High School and Intermediate students are not delayed due to the coronavirus.

Board Secretary Divyakant Shukla has issued an order in this regard. According to the

order, the UP Board 10th and 12th 2021 examinations will be held in March, while the admit cards will be issued in the first week of February or the second week. According to the order, UP Board 10th and 12th online classes will be started from August 18, 2020. Also, all the schools have been given time as of January 31 2021 to complete the course of all subjects of 10th and 12th. Strict action will be taken against schools for not completing the course by the stipulated time. In more than 27,000 secondary colleges affiliated to the UP Board, academic session has started since April but colleges are closed due to corona infection and teaching work has been affected. Five months after the session, the board administration released the academic calendar on Thursday. In this, online teaching is being started from August 18, although this study was to be held from August 1 but, two weeks time has not been available before Doordarshan. Class-wise programmes will be presented on Doordarshan's Swayambha channel and its detailed

timetable will be released separately. Principals have been given the responsibility of their teachers and students to see it compulsorily, while the District Inspectors of Schools (DIoS) and Director of Joint Divisional Education (JD) will supervise it.

The board said that authorised books for teaching work have been made available in all districts. The books are also available on the Diksha portal, e-books, its link is available on the UP Board website. Students can download books. Assessment of teaching will be carried out through a WhatsApp group created by teachers.

District Inspectors of School (DIoS) will train principals through NIC technical experts and other experts to study through webinars, online tutorials or WhatsApp. Then the Principal will impart training to the teachers.

The UP Board is starting online education from August 18. Monthly examinations of various classes will be conducted in the last week of every month through online and

offline. The teaching work is to be completed by January 31, 2021 in any case.

The Board has reduced the course of class 9 to 12 by 30 per cent in view of the corona infection. Remaining course studies will be conducted regularly. Presently, High School and Inter examination forms are being filled and registration is going on in classes 9 and 11.

The Board will start the practical examinations of various classes from the first or second week of February 2021. The pre-board will be organised in the third and fourth week of February. Home exams of class 9 and 11 will be conducted in the third and fourth week of February. At the same time, the Board's High School and Inter examination will be conducted in the month of March and April. The upcoming academic session will start from April 2021.

Board Secretary Divyakant Shukla said that in the academic calendar, it has been directed to conduct sports competitions in colleges, only physical distance will be required to be complied with.

## Police clamping down against Atique, Ashraf

Police have started clamping down against former MP Atique Ahmed and his younger brother Khalid Azim alias Ashraf, identified as mafia. Police are now identifying Ashraf's illegal assets. The seizure action will be taken soon under the Gangster Act. The cops are now gathering information about the flat at Okhla in Delhi and the piece of land at Kaushambi district.

Police have so far come to know during the investigation that Atique and Ashraf have

16 firms under different names. Someone's director is Atique and someone's Ashraf. Their close aides are also involved in it as the members..Crores of rupees worth of assets have been made in many places in the name of these firms. Atique Ahmed's 13 properties in Prayagraj city have been discovered that are believed to have been acquired through crime.

The process of confiscation is underway. Police officials also said that some plots have been detected in Ashraf's name in Kaushambi's

Poramufti and Pipri village, which is being verified. Sources said that Atique had owned a flat in Okhla, Delhi. Details of this are also being collected. SP City Dinesh Singh said that verification is being done with the team of Revenue department in this connection.

Meanwhile, IG KP Singh has instructed the officials concerned to speed up the ongoing action against mafia Atique Ahmed, former Block Pramukh Dilip Mishra, coporator Bachha Pasi and history-sheeter Rajesh Yadav. On

Friday evening, he held a meeting with the team of SSP, SP City, SP trans-Ganga, SP trans-Yamuna, CO, investigating officer and Revenue department at the Range Office.

During this, he laid emphasis on the confiscation of illegal assets, opening of history-sheets, better advocacy of cases and cancellation of licenses of the firearms of the goons. The IG said that nodal officers have been appointed to take action against the mafia and their gang members.



# Incessant rain plays havoc in Kanpur, exposes civic bodies

The incessant rains for two days have exposed the working of Kanpur Nagar Nigam, Jal Nigam and Jal Kal Vibhag, which failed to do anything to prevent the city from becoming an island and remaining waterlogged for the past two days.

Several people have been killed either in house collapses, or have been electrocuted or got drowned in deep stagnant water on roads. Properties worth crores of rupees have been damaged on account of water entering houses and shops leading to massive damage.

The tall claims of the KNN for its preparedness for mon-

soon have proved to bse hollow like in the past.

Mayor Pramila Pandey toured txhe city on a tractor and said a probe would be ordered and action taken against the erring authorities.

The heavy rains led to virtual collapse of the power and water supply in the city and lakhs of people did not get electricity and water.

The stagnant water due to choked sewers and drains flowed into houses and even the beds in houses were under water once the rain and sewer water entered the houses.

Ironically due to the breakdown of power supply, the people were unable to save their belonging from being damaged in rain water gushing

into their homes.

The Dadanagar Industrial Area suffered damages worth crores as the goods lying in the warehouses, especially chemicals and drugs, got damaged.

Similar was the condition in the Panki industrial site where the rain and sewer water flowed into the houses and godowns, damaging good and giving people no time to remove the goods to safer places.

President of Provincial Industries Association, Manoj Banka, lashed out at the administration and the KNN which, he said, failed to do anything to prevent waterlogging in the entire city.

He said most of the man-

holes were choked and the sewer water flowed on surfaces and entered factories and godowns.

Meanwhile, roads have dangerously caved in at over one dozen places in the city as a result of which several trauma cases were reported. With hospitals not admitting patients, the injured had a tough time in even getting first aid.

The VIP Road and Gwaltoli areas were under 7-foot water. Uprooted trees were being removed to allow the smooth movement on the roads.

District Magistrate BR Tiwari said that a sum of Rs 4 lakh was being given to the kin of each deceased.

## Covid recovery rate improves with home isolation

From the time home isolation has been allowed, the rate of people getting cured after being infected by coronavirus has slightly shot up after a very long time.

Chief Medical Officer Dr AK Mishra claimed that till date, 52.91 COVID-19 patients had recovered in the entire district. He said the slight improvement rate was certainly due to home isolation.

The CMO said a record number of 510 COVID-19 patients were cured and discharged from the entire district hospitals in the last 24 hours.

Dr Mishra said 381 coronavirus positive people placed in home isolation had completed their quarantine and were quite healthy.

Giving the total figures, he said till date 3,057 people were cured in hospital while 2,027 people had completed their home isolation.

He said recently it was viewed that there was a substantial improvement in home isolation cure rate.

However, he could not present the death rate figures of the state as even today between 10 and 15 people are dying on an average every day.

Meanwhile, associate professor in the GSYM Medical College respiratory medicine department has issued caution to diabetics to refrain from moving out of their homes as it has been observed that there is a direct damage of lungs in diabetics.

He said in case of diabetes, it had also been observed that despite giving oxygen on a high pressure through high flow nasal cannula, there was not much improvement in such COVID-19 patients and thus they were placed on VPAP and finally ventilators.

He advised diabetics, especially senior citizens, to refrain from moving out and visiting public places. He said the immunity of diabetics was already compromised and thus they were susceptible to infections.

## 305 more test positive

KANPUR (PNS): Kanpur Nagar reported 305more coronavirus positive cases on Friday.

Chief Medical Officer Dr Anil K Mishra said on Friday that with 305 more people testing positive for coronavirus infection in the last 24 hours, 9,806 confirmed cases had been reported from the city so far. He said with 139 COVID-19 patients being discharged from hospitals in the last 24 hours, 3,196 coronavirus infected people had been cured in the city and at present 4,200 active cases were undergoing treatment. The CMO said six more COVID-19 deaths were reported in the city, taking the toll to 309. He said a total of 2642 samples were sent for testing.

## CSJMU offers a course in Happiness

Keeping in mind the growing number of depression cases in students because of anxiety and examination pressure, the Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University (CSJMU) in Kanpur has started a certificate course in Happiness which is the first of its kind.

CSJMU Institute of Health Sciences incharge, Dr Praveen Katiyar, said the three-month, part time course would have 30 seats and candidates who have passed 10+2 or its equivalent examination in any discipline with minimum 45 per cent marks for general and 40 per cent marks for SC/ST would be eligible for admission.

The classes will run on Saturday or Sunday or on holidays with a minimum 48 teaching hours.

The course fee is Rs 8,950 for three months and August 17 is the last date for registration in the programme.

## ‘Conduct joint drive to check overloading’

## India at 74

The pandemic has given us our transformative moment. Probably to remind us of forgotten ideals that make up our civilisational DNA



On September 5, 2019, 74-year-old Erramatti Mangayamma gave birth to twin girls in Guntur, Andhra Pradesh, becoming the world's oldest mother after being called "barren" her whole life. At 74, Ferdinand Marie de Lesseps made an attempt to construct the Suez Canal. And at 77, John Glenn became the oldest person to go into space. The point of citing these inspirational figures, who were really ordinary men and women till they were challenged, is that no time is too early or too late enough to make a new beginning. And at 74, with perhaps one of the most unimaginable crises in our nation's history — the relentless pandemic,

the sliding economy, the collapse of democratic institutions, the chaos of sectarian politics and a conflict-ridden society — India is perhaps at that turning point in its timeline to correct its course and claim a new destiny. Perhaps this churning is necessary to prepare ourselves for a new century instead of relying on templates that we thought were transformative but are now past their prime. Had it not been for the pandemic and the crushing burden it imposed on our social and economic infrastructure, we wouldn't have bothered to look at rebuilding them. There's nothing wrong with globalisation except that when there is resource scarcity in every nation, as a pandemic-induced shutdown snapped mutual dependencies, we ought to be self-sufficient. The massive push to self-produce through *Atmanirbhar Bharat*, decentralising the agricultural economy and empowering rural India may not show results in the short-term. But at least the steps for the next big leap have been laid. China transformed itself in its lowest phase and became the world's largest producer. As a consumption-driven society, we are battling low demand and investment, but given the accelerators and enablers in economic packages, revival is possible. Graded targets for manufacturing at home, incentivisation and hand-holding through the initial break-through stage, standardisation of quality through technical partnerships with global expertise, developing economies of scale and allowing competition only to build better and robust home brands will get us there. Not insularity, but letting the trade winds blow so that we can make our mark on shop shelves around the world beyond the boutique handicrafts or tea. If we can be the world's largest producer of vaccines, we can be the factory floor for other products as well. Statistics speak for themselves. Most global chains and majors have, so far, not robbed domestic brands of their dedicated market but have had to indigenise their product lines instead. Pre-pandemic, India emerged as one of the fastest-growing major economies and post-recovery is projected to become one of the top three biggest economies in about a decade. And if the deep penetration of our digital economy is any indication, then that would be our competitive edge. These are also the days when India has awakened to its potential in the knowledge economy. Taking the COVID-19 management module as an example, just in a four-month period, we have developed our own test kits, exported drugs, ventilators and PPE kits, worked on our own vaccine and built multi-bed treatment facilities through both public spending and private partnerships. Imagine, what an increased health spending and a ground-up public health policy, especially at the primary and secondary levels, can do to ease medical treatment and not make it another nightmare for a nation battling serious disease burdens. For the first time, research and development (R&D) is being prioritised in the National Education Policy (NEP) with dedicated funding, compared to the last few years when money spent on it has been actually dwindling. The NEP's switch in emphasis from herd-oriented learning to an absorptive and application-based one should hopefully groom innovative minds and get us creditable research papers and patents, an area where our centres of excellence are still inadequate. So far, ISRO has been the only name that comes to mind when it comes to innovation, what with its missions to the moon and Mars. But science and technology will be the most meaningful when it impacts the life of the common man, still distressed and poor, and given Indian ingenuity, we could lead a solution-oriented talent pool.

Of course, our democracy has weathered many challenges and unfortunately, it faces its toughest survival test yet. It is no longer a culture but a tool. Politics has overtaken its true purpose, the purveyors of power using it to erode representative institutions and using collective angst and distress to arrogate more power to themselves. Policies are being weaponised for partisan purposes than public good. Though the shared crisis of COVID-19 did bring about some kind of cooperative federalism, we must not forget that happened only with an authoritarian sanction. Meanwhile, majoritarianism has become a mainstream virtue and secularism an ill-conceived vice, conformists of mainline discourse are true patriots while a thinking civil society has become an enemy of the State. The executive has become bigger than either the legislature or the judiciary and watchdog institutions like the media are either willing propagandists or ousted rebels. We are more disunited when we should be united as a pluralistic society. Yet the pandemic that has attacked us at a not too friendly age of 74 has brought out the best of human spirit, courage and compassion in everyday life. Probably to remind us of the ideals that make up our civilisational DNA. And, therefore, we are best placed to resurrect them than writing them off.

## Sputnik V and safety

Is Russia's vaccine truly effective without community trials or is it the beginning of a new commercial and political race?



Russia claims to have beaten the rest of the world and come out with a vaccine for the Coronavirus named 'Sputnik V'. However, even before it hits the markets, it has become mired in controversy, with several countries, and even traditional friend India, expressing some doubts over its efficacy. What has the experts worried is the pace at which Sputnik V has been produced, leaving behind front-runners like Oxford-AstraZeneca, Moderna and Pfizer. They fear that without large scale community trials, Moscow has cut corners and may have put the lives of those inoculated at risk. The Moscow-based Gamaleya Institute, which is

making the vaccine, got lightning speed regulatory approvals less than two months after it got into human trials. Compare this to other vaccine candidates in human trials that are not expected to be ready before early next year. However, Russia has claimed that such fast approvals were possible because Sputnik V resembles a vaccine for the Middle East Respiratory Syndrome that had already been tested greatly. This isn't the only controversy surrounding Russia and its bid to win the vaccine race. In July, it was accused of trying to steal vaccine research by the UK's National Cyber Security Centre. But the fact of the matter is that despite all the concerns of health and security experts, Moscow has got orders for one billion doses already from countries desperate to eradicate the pandemic. And even as Russia claims that India is one of the 20 nations to place an order, New Delhi has set up an expert committee headed by NITI Aayog member VK Paul to "consider the logistics and ethical aspects of procuring and administering the COVID-19 vaccine." The Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) can ask Russia to conduct late-phase human trials, usually both phase-2 and phase-3, on an Indian population. This is the usual requirement for all vaccines developed outside India.

But there are overlap issues. As over 50 per cent of vaccines are currently manufactured in India, the Pune-based Serum Institute of India has already tied up with other developers. Then, there is the issue of availability and competition with India's own vaccine. According to the Russian Register of Pharmaceuticals website, the vaccine would be in circulation from January 2021 but the Indian vaccine is expected to hit the market before that. So, how the Centre will balance out the country's need for a Corona vaccine with the commercial interests of Indian firms producing it remains to be seen.

## Pledge of independence

On our 74th Independence Day, we have perhaps forgotten that India's strength lies in unity and not conformity. We need to renew our vows

On August 15, 1947, India and its citizens gained independence with the British rule coming to an end. Loudly and proudly, we pronounced to the world that we, too, were ready to step out from the darkness of colonial rule to a new dawn, ripe with uncertainty but also hope. It is this hope that former Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru so eloquently captured in his address to the nation on the eve of India's independence. He opened his speech with, "Long years ago, we made a tryst with destiny..." His immortal words still send a chill down my spine. But too often, we focus only on the first few words. If we read his speech further, Nehruji talked about a pledge that we have renewed by obtaining freedom. A pledge "of dedication to the service of India and her people and to the still larger cause of humanity."

Few exemplified this pledge and dedication to the service of India more than Mohd Usman, also known as *Naushera ka sher* (the Lion of Naushera). At the time of India's independence, Mohd Usman was offered a high position in the Pakistan Army but he refused to join. Instead, he chose to help build a "new India" that had awakened on the fateful night of August 15. Usman bravely defended Naushera, causing a heavy toll on the Pakistani side but was martyred in July 1948 while fighting for his motherland. He was posthumously awarded the Maha Vir Chakra but more importantly, he remained a shining symbol of hope for a secular India. On his death, Khwaja Ahmad Abbas wrote, "...a precious life of imagination and unswerving patriotism has fallen a victim to communal fanaticism. Brigadier Usman's brave example will be an abiding source of inspiration for free India."

Such an example was necessary at a time when tension, fear and suspicion were writ large owing to the spectre of Partition. Not only did Usman dedicate his life to the service of India but also his death. Just as significant and poetic is the fact that six months before Usman was killed in a battle, another famous son of India, Jadunath Singh Rathore, who was under Usman's command, protected a nine-man forward section post, displaying unmatched brav-



ery against thousands of enemy forces. His bravery led to him being posthumously awarded the second-ever Param Vir Chakra. This sacrifice by two of India's brave sons — both were from different faiths but laid down their lives for the Indian dream — in all likelihood terrorised Pakistan more than any weapon could and still does.

So where does India stand today? Seventy two years after the death of these bravehearts, it seems that the fear and suspicion, that loomed large then, looms larger now. We are currently living in times where different sections of society are asked to prove their nationality. Proving one's nationality has been reduced to the idea of being subservient to a ruling class and not creating too much noise. This test is not limited to individuals of different faiths or people who come from different castes; it applies to anyone who does not agree with the view of the Government in power.

There are a number of instances where dissent against the Government and its actions are not only treated with the reckless exercise of power but also through an indiscriminate attack on the individual's patriotism. There are numerous examples that are in the public domain but one does not

even need to go that far. The author himself has been subjected to vile abuse and was branded "un-Indian" merely because he had written/spoken in favour of what he believed was right for the beloved country. This despite the fact that he served as a public servant and was awarded a medal for bravery by the Government itself. I can only imagine how an everyday citizen is treated when he/she dares to dissent.

A part of the reason why we are in this unfortunate position is that we have forgotten that India's strength lies in unity and not conformity. We are steadily moving towards a time where dissent in a non-violent form and the free flow of ideas is stymied by authoritarian force or by the loudest voice. We have forgotten that our enemies as Indians are not our countrymen, who may follow different faiths or eat different foods, but illiteracy, hunger and corruption.

In his speech, Nehru recognised this when he said, "The service of India means the service of the millions who suffer. us into. Instead, it is the fight against poverty, illiteracy and disease that plague millions of Indians.

This is one of the main reasons why I am proud of the work done by the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). The party's goal is to remain true to the nationalistic spirit through its work. This is why the Delhi model of governance has received such widespread credit in areas of health, education and transparency. All of this has been achieved by people of all faiths, gender and caste. By treating service to one another as the truest form of patriotism, we are united by purpose and enriched by our non-conformity.

## \$5 trillion GDP a distant dream

By all calculations, the COVID-19 impact has pushed India's \$5 trillion goal back by three years

The Prime Minister has laid down a visionary target of making India a \$5 trillion economy by 2024-25. This has stimulated debate and discussion among economists and policymakers to seek roadmaps to attain this optimistic economic goal. This discussion garners more significance given the current domestic and global economic slowdown coupled with domestic price instability, the US-China trade war and the current pandemic. Amid such global and domestic challenges, two questions arise: Will India become a \$5 trillion economy? What should be done to help India attain its goal?

It is necessary to empirically diagnose India's growth pattern to meet the objective of a \$5 trillion Gross Domestic Product (GDP) from the current level of \$2.9 trillion. The latest estimate of the GDP for 2019-20 and the exchange rate of ₹70.39 per dollar (average exchange rate of 2019-20) yield a \$2.9 trillion GDP that has to touch \$5 in five years. This implies exchange rate adjusted Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of about 13.5 per cent, which is close to the Niti Aayog's projection of 11.5 per cent. However, the \$5 trillion GDP target was originally set during the pre-COVID-19 scenario, which has now made this target impossible to achieve owing to the disastrous consequences of the lockdown on the economy.

Amid the macroeconomic shocks and uncertainties, many national and global institutions and rating agencies have been releasing a revised GDP growth forecast for 2020-21. S&P and Fitch Solutions have projected India's GDP growth rate for 2020-21 as -5 per cent. The World Bank maintained a -3.2 per cent growth outlook. In contrast, Moody's Investors Services and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) posited non-negative growth numbers of zero per cent and two per cent for the current financial year (FY). On May 22, the RBI postulated the GDP growth in the negative territory. It further released a projection of -1.5 per cent growth for 2020-21 in its *Survey of Professional Forecasters* report in June. However, most projections predict above eight per cent growth outlook in the FY 2021-22, owing to the fiscal and monetary stimulus and reforms announced by the Government accompanied by the unravelling of the pent-up aggregate demand in the economy.

However, incorporating the adversity in GDP growth, due to the pandemic, it is best to consider a GDP growth rate of nearly -3.2 per cent for 2020-21 relying on the World Bank's estimate and the RBI's negative territory forecast. This growth number, while being conservative, hovers around the other negative estimates and thus is a tenable representative of all the growth projections made by various multilateral institutions and agencies. It is inevitable that subdued growth for the initial year (2020-21) of the \$5 trillion target trajectory will either devolve the growth pressure to subsequent years or push the target year to a later period.

Realistic estimation for the post-COVID-19 period i.e., from 2021-22 to 2024-25, yields a CAGR of 18.1 per cent, incorporating a -3.2 per cent GDP growth for 2020-21. This estimate indicates that the Indian economy has to grow at an annual rate of 18.1 per cent to attain a GDP target of \$5 trillion by 2024-25, which looks more surreal than real. Plus, each one per cent decrease in the growth rate for the current year yields an additional burden of 0.3 per cent in the CAGR for the subsequent years of the growth trajectory. Given the unrealistic-looking projected growth rate of 18.1 per cent, one needs to look at the alternative to attain the \$5 trillion target which is, naturally, a postponement of the target year.

In the post-COVID-19 period, the economy is expected to recover and revive as argued by multilateral institutions, rating agencies and economists. In fact, economists have even gone ahead and contemplated that the Indian market will emerge stronger than ever post-COVID-19, given the liquidity support and future demand. This revival is attributable to stimulus and reforms announced by the Government for all the productive sectors. However, the effectiveness of these stimuli and reforms would depend on their implementation and thus remains debatable. If not a big bang, a green shoot is expected to knock on the door of the economy in the next FY, replicating a V-shaped recovery to some extent.

Given this, from 2021-22, the economy's productive sectors, i.e. agriculture, industry and services, will follow their respective historical growth trajectories. Thus, it is expected that these productive sectors, post-COVID-19, will grow at the historical average of the previous five years of about 7.5 per cent, 9.0 per cent and 11.4 per cent, respectively. This looks more realistic and acceptable than the 18.1 per cent annual growth rate, derived and discussed earlier. This consideration and associated analysis revealed that the Indian economy will attain only \$3.8 trillion by 2024-25 and reach the \$5 trillion target by 2027-28 with a CAGR of 9.97 per cent. This implies that the COVID-19 impact has pushed India's \$5 trillion dream back by three years.

The ambitious \$5 trillion economic objective intends to provide a stimulus to the economy while raising many pragmatic challenges to achieve it. This objective can be achieved by providing an appropriate fillip to the growth of agriculture, industry and services sectors that are drivers of the Indian economy. However, a data-driven approach reveals that the growth attained by the present GDP patterns is far from the target required to attain the \$5 trillion objective. However, it is possible to attain this target by 2027-28 when there is a recovery in the economy during the post-COVID-19 period coupled with a consistent growth in productive sectors over the years.

Historically, the services and industry sectors show a high correlation with the overall GDP growth rate but they need consistent stimulus for growth. In fact, the productive sectors collectively can deliver viable growth rates that may put the Indian economy into the \$5 trillion club by 2027-28.

Any moderate shock to one sector may be absorbed by the other sector, but a major shock cannot be tackled and can derail the \$5 trillion growth trajectory. Thus, policymakers must focus on all the three sectors equally without focussing on any particular one. Along with the individual growth of a sector, its dynamics with other sectors and its contribution to the economy are evenly important. This could be achieved by attracting Foreign Direct Investment and strengthening the Regional Innovation Systems to encourage local firms to network, innovate and globalise.

# Shun vitriolic leaders

The community should be represented by some liberally-balanced Muslims who know history and at the same time are rooted in their faith. Or else we could be stranded in a wasteland

A lot of water has flowed under the bridge since 1947. The 200 million plus population of Indian Muslims was the one, that at the call of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad from the steps of old Delhi's Jama Masjid, put down its luggage meant for the next Lahore train from the Old Delhi Railway Station. In all probability, theirs was the right decision, in spite of the fact that many of their relatives had decided to leave for their El Dorado — the newly created Pakistan. Even today most of the Indian Muslims living in Old Delhi have their relatives in the country across the border. Religious frenzy has never augured well for any community in India and the world. In the words of eminent Muslim thinker, AG Noorani, the "two-nation theory" was, in effect, an offshoot of the constant friction and confrontation stirred up between the two communities and it was under exceptional circumstances that Jinnah's concept gained popularity among the Muslims. Indeed, the whole country responded to the "two-nation theory." The greatest religion for both communities became Hindu-Muslim hatred. This mephitic form of politics saw its culmination in 1947 when a wall of hatred rose between the two communities.

**Partition horrors:** Elders would describe the gory sight of trains full of mauled, murdered, mutilated and dead Hindus chugging into the stations from Pakistan and similar trains from India, full of dead and mutilated Muslims pulling into Pakistan. These were called "blood trains" and all too often they crossed the border in funeral silence. Huts, houses, bungalows and mansions were burnt and robbed on both sides. Women were raped and murdered, children were killed in front of their parents, some women on both sides of the border jumped into wells and rivers while men also killed their wives and daughters to save them from dishonour.

**Jinnah and Nehru both responsible:** Jinnah on the Muslim front and Nehru in opposition to Jinnah, both barristers full of intellectual rivalry to be one up against the other, instead of preserving the sovereignty of India, started dreaming of being the new kings of the nascent kingdoms. Azad was blatantly ignored and sidelined by the Congress because he considered both Nehru and Jinnah as the main villains of the vivisection. He could read well into Nehru's flagrant opportunism and ambition to be the first Prime Minister of the new nation.

Azad was quite aggravated about the Partition and had accused Nehru of being lured into the Partition by Lady Edwina Mountbatten. Even in the play *Maulana Azad*, by noted playwright and scriptwriter, Dr Saeed Alam, Tom Alter, playing the protagonist, was heard stating in chaste Urdu, *'Log kehney hain, aur theek hi kehney hongey, ke Jawahar Lal ko bawara pe raazi karney mein us charming lady ka bahut bada haath tha.* (People say, and they must be right, that the charming lady played a big role in getting Jawahar Lal to accept the Partition.)" Today's Muslim leadership, bereft of thinkers like Maulana Azad and Dr Zakir Hussain, has lost both its voice and utility. During every election, it has been seen that all leaders are power-brokers indulging in pernicious vote-bank manipulation, acquiring State patronage themselves and leaving ordinary Muslims to the mercy of God.

**Muslims misled:** Despite that, Muslims won't fully trust Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who had declared in a meeting with eminent clerics and intellectuals at his residence on June 6, 2015, that he wanted to see in each Muslim's hands the holy *Quran* and a computer. When Home Minister Amit Shah said, "Muslims are like our children. We want to treat

them equally on a par with others", hardly any member of the community hailed it. This opposing mindset is creating a major problem in better integration with the mainstream. Battered by the populist rhetoric and provocative militancy of its myopic ill-educated clerics and shallow youth, the nation's cultured and high potential minority stands at the crossroads. Owing to their obscurantist approach, they are leading the community back to the dark ages of ignorance, like the ones in Arab countries before the advent of Islam. More often than not, they are interested in feathering their own nests and are indulging in petty-mindedness characterised by an extremely narrow and irresponsible outlook completely out of tune with the existing reality. Such leaders are not seriously interested in dealing with the main problems of the community. Muslim leaders and petty politicians are becoming richer day-by-day while the people they represent are languishing in ghettos.

In this ghettoised situation emerged the churlish political middlemen as interlocutors for communities, picking on sensational issues that would only apparently tighten their stranglehold on the gullible and divert attention from the real bread and butter and educational issues. Shah Bano, Jamia Millia, the AMU's minority character, Taslima Nasreen, Salman Rushdie and so on became issues. However, none of them had any bearing on the real problems of the Muslims. Educational backwardness, women's education, social stagnation, communalisation of the police force and absence from the mainstream were never addressed by the self-appointed interlocutors with the same emphasis as the Babri Masjid issue. It is thanks mainly to this leadership that Muslims remain stranded in a wasteland of missed opportunities even 73 years after Independence.

**Muslims' ghetto mindset, the main problem:** Indian Muslims, who now call themselves "Muslim Indians" deliberately, do agree that Pakistan today has

become hell on Earth. Yet they fail to thank their God and stars that they are far better in India as compared to those in Pakistan in terms of safety and security of life. My Karachi-based cousin has told me that after dusk, all city roads become deserted. I have a few questions to ask my Indian co-religionists. How is it going to benefit them when they abuse the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), the BJP and Modi? Will constantly howling for reservations based on religion not discredit them?

Why do the so-called intellectuals and clerics instead of coolly convincing, heckle opponents in TV debates? All this has created a negative perception of Muslims in the country. My concern is that if these questions are not satisfactorily answered, relations between Hindus and Muslims will worsen. So far at least the answers that have come from educated Muslims have been deeply unsatisfactory or incomplete. The community should be represented by some liberally-balanced Muslims, who know history and at the same time are rooted in their faith.

However, the situation with the ghetto mindset of the Muslim community today is rather grim as they remain critical of the system in general and try to run a parallel governance via the AIMPLB (All-India Muslim Personal Law Board), the *Sharia* courts and the so-called rabble-rousing leaders like the Owaisi brothers, Azam Khan and a horde of perennial apologists seen in TV debates. Rather than serving the community and the nation, their vitriolic remarks create a perception of the community that all the Muslims are similar, which is not true. As per my assessment, more than 50 per cent Indian Muslims are with a progressive idea of India. However, they are tight-lipped and don't want to come out openly in support of the present Government for fear of being socially boycotted or stigmatised as RSS stooges and BJP sycophants.

**Prophet's teachings forgotten:** The problem with today's Muslims is that they

don't follow the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) in letter and spirit. This actually distances them from Islam as well, because, Islam possesses sufficient elasticity to enable it to adapt itself to the social and political revolution going on around it. The Mohammedan Common Law (today AIMPLB), or *Shariah*, is by no means unchangeable or unalterable. A practical example of it is the ban of triple *talaq*, a part of *Sharia* but not mentioned in the holy *Quran* and absolutely abhorred by the Prophet. The only law unalterable in Islam is essentially the *Quran* and the traditions of the Prophet. The team of Modi, Shah and Ravi Shankar Prasad, the Law Minister, have banned the draconian *Sharia* law besides settling the eons old *mandir-masjid* imbroglio.

But across India, despite the many problems, the community is forging ahead. Large numbers are doing exceedingly well. The 1992 Babri mosque razing led to major churning. The dominant consensus was that it was important to concentrate on education. That process continues. On November 9, 2019, the issue got amicably settled and none of the Muslims, except the AIMPLB or Owaisi brothers, protested.

**Light at the end of the tunnel:** More and more Muslim women, even in smaller towns, are acquiring an education. Although a Muslim political party has come up in Assam, another one in Telangana and two have been formed in Uttar Pradesh, most Muslims swear by secular national parties. It is time that Muslims realise that the RSS is a reality and Modi is a Prime Minister who has pledged "*Sabka Sath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas* (Compassion for all, Progress for all, Trust for all)." It is the responsibility of Muslims to hold him to account and ensure that he remains committed to India's pluralistic leitmotif.

## MSMEs need help to keep afloat

Invest in a mechanism to strengthen the longevity muscle of MSMEs as that would help break barriers and capture global markets

Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) are the flavour of the season. Promoting inclusive growth by providing employment opportunities in rural areas to women and people belonging to marginalised sections of society, they are the new engines of India's growth story. Contributing about 29 per cent to India's GDP, the vision is to increase this contribution to about 50 per cent. Collectively employing over 120 million people, second only to the mammoth agriculture sector, the MSME sector contributes over 45 per cent to India's overall exports.

A net gain is also reduction of regional imbalances and a more equitable distribution of national income and

wealth. MSMEs by design have high flexibility and strong ties to customers and suppliers.

The focus on customer needs, detailed knowledge and experience is many times difficult to replicate. Low overheads often aid lower fluctuations in their business cycle. With a very positive climate in the thinking on MSMEs, where policy, polity and production seem to have come together in fitting measure, all seems to be well in this rapidly upcoming 63 million-sector. It is primed to help move the economy towards the \$5 trillion mark.

Some chinks below the surface, however, need attention and merit early correction. The MSME sector operates primarily on a cash basis and has less access to formal sources of credit. The financial stress of operation, which has been curtailed due to the lockdown and the continuing overhead expenses, however small, has created a burden on many of these companies, which are struggling and are on the brink of shutting down or have already shut down.

With the overall slowdown in the economy and the prospect of a tepid

growth in future demand, this sector will be hard hit. For the MSME sector not to become a "me too" sector, asking for complete Government support and the Government in turn nudging the unwilling banking sector to provide credit in a high default risk scenario, the options available are seemingly limited. An enhanced working capital limit and guarantee on loans to small businesses seem to be the way ahead.

The biggest need for working capital — MSME bank loans — is contested by the banks. Processes are lengthy and loan queues are long. The MSMEs can't get loans and hence don't grow and because they don't grow, they don't get loans. It is a classic "catch-22" situation. Ironically, large lending to big corporations continues despite the risk of them becoming insolvent.

The credit gap for MSMEs as estimated by the International Finance Corporation (IFC) and Intelcap stands at ₹16.7 lakh crore. Loan approvals, logistics support, technology access and market access work against the MSME growth ambition. Unlike large companies, they do not have the support of a

strong network of people, resources and marketing channels, most of which become easily accessible with scale.

MSMEs are often seen competing with large corporations and this should be avoided through policy measures. Certain products and categories should be prioritised for MSMEs along with pre-defined quality standards. What affects the MSMEs further is that they don't have the experience of learnings from management education to have an appropriate appreciation of the grammar of business. Theirs is a hit and trial growth.

The future of MSMEs depends significantly on big corporations buying from them. They thus link up with big businesses through disadvantaged negotiations of prices and payment terms, forcing them to borrow more and more. Add to that scenario, the difficulties of delayed income tax and Goods and Services Tax (GST) refunds which further prevent growth. Thus, in the payment hierarchy, where MSMEs are last and have little bargaining power, they are forced to continue the relationship which is contingent on them remaining

small. Equally, the MSMEs are unable to apply pressure to reduce dues as they are made to feel that their future business is at stake. Due to the lack of skilled and professional manpower, they are unable to create the required pressure.

Their access to grievance redressal is either not available or has very low resolution levels. Many don't know how to leverage the redressal system. They fear that seeking such remedy would jeopardise their future business as ultimately they have to fall back on the same business houses for repeat business and the same service providers. For the MSMEs, a nose above the water is as good as it gets.

The creation of a favourable ecosystem for MSMEs would thus remain contingent on regulators assisting in clearance of their bills. Pay or be dealt with swiftly or pay up the interest which the MSMEs are paying for no fault of theirs. Investing in a mechanism to build resilience and strengthen the longevity muscle of MSMEs would help break barriers and capture global markets.

## India won't compromise with its self-esteem, says Rajnath

As the situation on the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Eastern Ladakh remains tense for nearly three months now, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Friday said India has never attacked anywhere to capture land of others. Reiterating this, he also said India believes in winning hearts and not land. “But it does not mean we will let our self-esteem be hurt,” he said.

Making this assertion during the customary address to the troops on the eve of the Independence Day, he, however, cautioned if attacked India as always will give a befitting reply. He, however, did not name China.

“Whatever we do in national security, we always do it for self-defence, not for attacking others. If enemy

country ever attacked us, like every time we will give a befitting reply,” he said.

His observations came in the backdrop of five rounds of military level and four at the diplomatic level in the past few weeks failing to resolve the stand-offs now on at four friction points. Moreover, China has not withdrawn its troops from these sites despite agreement thereby leading to tension in the area.

In his address, the defence minister assured that the government is doing all that is necessary to keep our forces morale high and fulfill their all operational requirement.

Later in his tweet message, he paid tributes to the soldiers. “On the eve of India's Independence Day, I salute the indomitable courage of the brave soldiers of our Armed Forces who are self-

lessly serving the nation. Their unmatched courage and patriotism has ensured that our country is safe,” he said.

In another tweet, the minister said the Government is leaving no stone unturned to strengthen the armed forces and ensure the welfare of their families and the ex-servicemen.

Amid the ongoing stand-off, the Defence Ministry has given the armed forces emergency financial powers to procure weapons systems up to Rs 300 crores on an urgent basis without any further clearances to cut short the procurement cycle.

The Services have embarked on major procurements of ammunition, anti-tank missiles, man portable air defences, unmanned aerial vehicles among others.

## Def Min launches portal providing access to defence vendors

Speaking on the occasion, Rajnath said signing of these MoUs and contracts will lead us to self-reliance in the technologies related to defence manufacturing. He called upon the Indian industry partners to show complete commitment and take proactive participation in the pursuit of Indigenisation and self-reliance in the defence sector.

Commending the DDP for creating SRIJAN portal, the minister said this will help industry partners to play active role in the goal of self-reliance in defence sector. Pursuant to Atmanirbhar Bharat announcement, Department of Defence

Production has developed an indigenization portal, srijan-defence.gov.in, as “opportunities for Make in India in Defence”, which will give information on items that can be taken up for indigenisation by the private sector.

On this portal, DPSUs/OFB/SHQs can display their items which they have been importing or are going to import which the Indian Industry can design, develop and manufacture as per their capability or through joint venture with OEMs. The Indian Industry will be able to show their interest.

There are over 3,000 unique items with a value of over ₹10,000 Crore that are available through the portal.

## Fromer Maha CM Fadnavis may get key role in Bihar election

The BJP is expected to give former Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis a key role in the Bihar election, due later this year.

A move is afoot to appoint Fadnavis as election-in-charge of Bihar polls, according to sources.

The former Maharashtra Chief Minister's role assumes importance in the backdrop of a raging controversy around the death of Sushant Singh Rajput, a young and rising Bollywood actor and a native of Bihar. Sushant's parents have lodged an FIR in the state in the case.

The BJP has been alleging that the Mumbai police under the Shiv Sena-NCP-Congress coalition was not conducting a fair probe in the circumstances leading to what has initially been termed as “suicide”.

Fadnavis has been in the forefront in attacking Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray and his son for the handling of the actor's case and demanding a CBI probe into his death and “justice” for him.

The issue of the 34-year-old actor's death triggered charges and counter-charges between the two States with

Maharashtra Shiv Sena leaders accusing the BJP-JD (U) coalition Government in Bihar of politicising the investigation to serve its political ends when assembly polls are round the corner.

The Bihar Government's eagerness to take up the case of Rajput is seen by many as a move to consolidate “thakur votes” in the state as also a gesture that the Nitish Kumar-led government was standing by its ‘son of the soil’ and his family in distress.

The reports of the appointment of Fadnavis have been growing since he chaired a core committee meeting of the BJP's Bihar unit party on August 13 and BJP President J P Nadda directing leaders in Bihar unit to brief former Maharashtra Chief Minister on the campaign strategy.

Fadnavis, the first Brahmin CM of Maharashtra who lost his second run in the state as CM, has been living in political shadows in Maharashtra after the ‘Maha vikas Aghadi’ coalition took reins of governance in the State.

The BJP is also expecting to benefit from Fadnavis' Brahmin origins. Brahmins constitute 5 percent of the population in Bihar.

## 1,087 new cases take Gujarat's tally to 76,569

**Gandhinagar:** Gujarat on Friday reported 1,087 new Covid-19 case, taking the State's total tally to 76,569, while 15 new fatalities pushed the death toll to 2,748, health officials said.

As many as 1,083 patients were discharged in the last 24 hours, taking the total number of recoveries to 59,522.

Hotspot Surat continued to lead the state's tally with 232 cases, followed by Ahmedabad (161), Vadodara (107), Rajkot (99), Jamnagar (56), Panchmahals (40), Junagadh (39), Gandhinagar (36), Bhavnagar Gir-Somnath and Mahesana (24 each), Bharuch and Dahod with (23 each), Kutch (22), Morbi (21), Banaskantha (15), Patan and Surendranagar (13 each), Anand (12), Navsari (10), Valsad (9), Sabarkantha (8), Kheda and Narmada (7 each), Botad and Chhota Udepur (6 each), Tapi (5), Mahisagar and Porbandar (4 each), and Aravalli and Devbhumi Dwarka (3 each).

## India exports 23 lakh PPEs to 5 countries

With export norms relaxed, India managed to export 23 lakh Personnel Protection Equipments to five countries namely the USA, the UK, UAE, Senegal and Slovenia in just a month.

“This has substantially aided India to position itself in the global export market of PPEs,” said a statement from the Union Health Ministry.

PPEs are a crucial medical resource for frontline workers during the pandemic that include body coveralls, N-95 masks, goggles, face shields among others.

According to the Ministry, the ‘Make in India’ spirit embedded in the ‘Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan’ has resulted in providing resilience and self-sufficiency” to the country for various medical equipment including PPEs.

While the Union

Government is supplying PPE kits, N95 masks, ventilators etc., to the State governments and union territories administrations, states are also procuring these items directly.

“Between March and August 2020, they have procured 1.40 crore indigenous PPE from their own budgetary resources. During the same period, the Centre has distributed 1.28 crore PPE to states, UTs and central institutions, free of cost,” said the ministry in a statement.

The Centre has been leading the graded, pre-emptive, proactive and collaborative response and management of COVID-19, along with the states union territories.

As part of its continued efforts towards progressively augmenting and strengthening the medical infrastructure across the country, various policy decisions have been taken on a regular basis.

At the start of the pandemic, there was a global shortage of all kinds of medical equipment including N95 masks, PPE kits, ventilators etc, the ministry underlined.

Most of the products were not being manufactured in the country in the beginning as many of the necessary components were to be procured from other countries. The rising global demand due to the pandemic resulted in their scarce availability in the foreign markets, it stated.

Turning the pandemic into an opportunity to develop its domestic market for production of medical equipment, with the combined efforts of ministries of health, textiles, pharmaceuticals, Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Defence Research and Development Organisation and others, India has hugely ramped up its own manufacturing capacity, the ministry said.

## Number of deaths due to smokeless tobacco in India is on rise: Study

The number of deaths due to smokeless tobacco in India is on the rise, accounting for 70 per cent of deaths in the South-East Asia region followed by Pakistan (seven per cent) and Bangladesh which accounts five per cent of the global disease burden due to smokeless tobacco.

Researchers added that deaths due to it globally has also gone up by a third in seven years to an estimated 350,000 people.

The research, published in the journal BMC Medicine,

comes at a time when there are concerns that spitting - a behaviour common among those who chew tobacco - is likely to transmit the Covid-19 virus.

“The study has come at a time when Covid-19 is affecting almost all aspects of our lives. Chewing tobacco increases saliva production and leads to compulsive spitting,” said study researcher Kamran Siddiqi from the University of York in the UK.

There are concerns that spitting - a behaviour common among those who chew tobacco- is likely to transmit the virus to others.

“In acknowledgement of this, India, for example, has already taken a positive step by banning spitting in public places to reduce the transmission of COVID-19,” Siddiqi added.

The study estimated that in 2017 alone smokeless tobacco resulted in more than 90,000 deaths due to cancers of the mouth, pharynx and oesophagus and accounted for more than 258,000 deaths from heart disease.

Millions more have their lives shortened by ill-health due to the effects of chewing tobacco-based products, the study reveals.

## Kadha’ stalls, another start-up in corona times

With a cure for coronavirus still not known, more and more people are turning to Ayurvedic ‘Kadha’ prescriptions to keep the virus at bay.

In a new start-up, kiosks selling Kadhas have sprung in at several places, especially those frequented by morning walkers.

“We used to sell juices of bottle gourd, bitter gourd here, but now we have added Kadha and the majority of our customers prefer a glass of this Ayurvedic concoction,” said

Ramesh Sharma who sets up a stall near a park in Indira Nagar locality every morning.

Ramesh claims that his wife and mother prepare the Kadha by boiling various species, including cardamom, ginger, nutmeg, peppercorns, basil leaves, cinnamon, honey and turmeric. However, he admitted that he was not aware of the quantity of spices that should go into the making of the decoction.

He sells a small glass of the concoction for Rs 40 and many customers even get it packed for home.

Swadesh Sharma, a septu-

agenarian, said, “I drink one cup and take home three cups. My wife and I drink this Kadha twice a day.”

Ravindra Kumar, another morning walker and a regular Kadha customer, said that preparing the decoction at home was a cumbersome task.

“My wife and I go to work and we barely get time to cook a meal. Preparing the Kadha takes a lot of time so we drink a cup here,” he said.

Almost all the morning walkers who flock to the Kadha stalls, said that they had learnt about the benefits of this from TV and newspapers.

# ‘Riots started within 3 hours of FB post’

**Bengaluru:** The recent Bengaluru riots occurred at breakneck speed, erupting in less than three hours of the derogatory message being put up on social media, a police official said on Friday. “Naven posted the derogatory message around 6 p.m. and by 9 pm the riots erupted,” Central Crime Branch (CCB) Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Kuldeep Jain told IANS. The government machinery was already strained with battling the Coronavirus pandemic, and the riots caught them unawares. On Tuesday night, hundreds of people ran amok after Pulikeshinagar’s Congress MLA Akhanda Srinivas Murthy’s nephew P Naven posted a derogatory message on social media. The mob pelted stones, injuring 60 police-

men, and committed acts of vandalism and arson in DJ Halli, KG Halli, Pulikeshinagar and Kaval Byrasandra areas. “As soon as the news reached the police, cops from nearby police stations rushed to the spot,” said Jain. Police Commissioner Kamal Pant himself rushed to the riot-affected areas to monitor the situation. The police was initially overwhelmed with the rioters outnumbering them. “By that time whatever preventive things we could do, we tried it out. All that did not calm down the mob,” he said. It was only after the police fired in the air and later at the rioters, leading to the death of three people, did the situation come under control. IANS

# Terrorists kill two cops on outskirts of Srinagar

Ahead of the Independence Day celebrations, heavily armed terrorists, believed to be the cadre of Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) terror outfit on Friday shot dead two policemen and wounded another in “indiscriminate” firing on the outskirts of Srinagar near Nowgam bypass. The terrorists seem to have done thorough recon of the area before targeting the patrol party of Jammu & Kashmir police. They disappeared in the bylanes of the densely populated area even before the security personnel could chase them. Inspector General of police, Kashmir range, Vijay Kumar who visited the spot told reporters, “the terrorists emerged from Gulshan street on the outskirts of the Srinagar city near Nowgam bypass and targeted the policemen by opening indiscriminate firing around 9.30 a.m.” He said three policemen received injuries but two among them succumbed to their

injuries. The martyred jawans of Jammu & Kashmir police were identified as Constables Ishfaq Ayoub and Fayaz Ahmad of IRP 20 Bn. IG Vijay Kumar said, “elaborate security deployment was done on ground zero to ensure incident free Independence day celebrations in the valley”. He said after the terror strike the entire area has been cordoned off to track down the footprints of the terrorists behind the attack. He said, preliminary reports suggested JeM cadre were behind the attack. He maintained, the security personnel also exercised restraint by not opening indiscriminate firing due to the heavy civilian movement in the area. Later in the day, a tribute ceremony was organised at the police headquarters where senior officers including DGP Jammu & Kashmir police paid their tribute and remembered the supreme sacrifices of the jawans of the J&K police. The mortal remains were later shifted to their local residences in Srinagar where thou-

sands of residents paid their last tributes and joined the funeral of policemen. Wailing women and close relatives were seen chanting slogans during the funeral procession of martyred policemen. Interacting with the media persons, DGP Dilbagh Singh said, “it is the handiwork of the Pakistan and its proxies who don’t want to see peace prevailing in the region. He said, the security situation has largely improved in Kashmir valley but in between when such incidents occur our resolve to restore peace gets strengthened. Referring to measures adopted by the security forces ahead of the 1-day celebrations, DGP said, drone cameras and camera fitting vehicles have been deployed at various places to ensure complete area domination during the 1-Day function. The security forces are also directed to remain in a state of high alert across Jammu & Kashmir to prevent fresh strikes on the security convoys and other vital security installations.

# Officer denies about diplomatic baggage

Sunil Kumar, Kerala State Protocol Officer reportedly told the sleuths of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) probing the gold smuggling racket busted by the Customs department recently that no diplomatic baggage has come to the UAE Consulate at Thiruvananthapuram during the last two years. The statement has put the CPI(M) led LDF Government in Kerala in dilemma as KT Jaleel, the Higher Education Minister has been claiming that he had received Ramzaan kits and thousands of copies of Quran sent by the UAE Consulate at Thiruvananthapuram through diplomatic consignment. Kerala BJP president K Surendran had alleged on Thursday that the baggage contained gold bars instead of Quran and the same was transported to different parts of Kerala through the official vehicles of Jaleel, a former leader of the outlawed SIMI. But Jaleel denied all allegations and declared that he was ready to face probe by any agencies including the NIA, CBI or the Enforcement Directorate, Sunil Kumar reportedly told the NIA officials that he does not have any information about the Ramzaan kits addressed to Jaleel’s office from the UAE Consulate in the capital city. The NIA sleuths has asked Sunil Kumar to furnish the details of the diplomatic consignments received by the State Government Departments from the UAE Consulates and all other foreign missions operating in the country. All materials addressed to the State Government officials from diplomatic missions in the country are received by the State Protocol Officer before handing it over to the concerned departments. Sunil Kumar’s explanation to the NIA has come hours before the Kerala BJP president Surendran alleged that Shine Haq, the former State Protocol Officer was hand in glove with those involved in gold smuggling. “Though Haq was transferred out of the Protocol Office, he managed to get back to the office in a senior position and he continued to meddle with the affairs of the SPO,” Surendran had alleged in a press meet on Thursday at Kozhikode.

# Wildlife lovers appeal Modi to save endangered black bucks

The wild life lovers and NGO of Aligarh have appealed to the Prime Minister of India to save the endangered species of Black bucks of this region. They said that if such steps are not taken by the Government on urgent basis the Black Bucks will become history and be banished from this region. Once this region used to be very rich with the presence of Black deers but on account of the killing of endangered species by rich persons belonging to Aligarh city and so called, Nawabs of the districts now only 357 black deers are believed to be exist in the region. Bankebihari Gupta, president of LATA NGO Said that “Aligarh was very rich with the presence of Black buck. But due to pouching the life of endangered species are in danger. We have written several letter to District Administration. But Administration have turned a blind eye regarding this evil menace. At last We have appealed to the Prime Minister of India to save the endangered species of Black deers of this

region”. Sources of wild life department of U P Government that some 10 years ago the number of black deers in the district was estimated to be 5347. The black bucks were found in the jungles of villages Sunthla Rahim Kot, Surajpur Jaivana Birpura, Alahdarpur, Gurskien Jarkhera Lohgarh and Saidman under the areas of Atrauli, Kher and Koil Tehsils of the district. It is worth mentioning that this species have their own history as several authors have written about free movements of Black deers in Aligarh district. According to manuscripts on records, Sir Thomas Row a British who visited India in the beginning of 17th Century in the region of Emperor Jahangir had written that black deers and peacocks were seen moving in almost whole of the area of Koil (Aligarh). Similarly another tourist Hawkins has written that in the surrounding of Delhi, Agra and Aligarh (Koil) large number of herds of black bucks were seen, now with the passage of time the number has considerably reduced and few left alone are struggling for their existence.

# No two power centres in Maha, CM only leader, Pawar architect of our Govt: Raut

Alluding to Pawar’s role in the Shiv Sena-led Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) in the state, Raut said: “Pawar saheb played a key role in the formation of the MVA government in the State. He has a major role to play in our gov-

ernment. He is the most experienced political leader in the state and has vast administrative experience. No one has as much experience as he has governance matters in the state”. “Hence his guidance is valuable for our government. What is wrong if someone goes to him and seeks advice?. And we need the guidance of Pawar sahib,” Raut said. Replying to another question, Raut slammed the Opposition BJP for politicising the Sushant Singh Rajput suicide cases purposely.. “In view of the impending Bihar Assembly elections, the Opposition BJP is deriving political mileage out of the Sushant Singh Rajput suicide case”. When his attention was drawn to the NCP chief’s disapproval of his grandnephew Rohit Pawar’s demand for CBI probe into the alleged Sushant Singh Rajput suicide case, Raut said: “You should see the whole episode as a grandfather giving his grand nephew. Even late Bal Thackeray used to rebuke the youngsters when something went wrong. His family members as well all of us used to feel happy. Because, if he got irritated with us, we would think he was keeping a watch on us. Even in Rohit’s case, Pawar did not say whatever he said in an irritating tone. Whatever he said was over that day. Now it has become a family matter”.

# Kerala CM, 7 Ministers go into quarantine

Covid-19 is causing havoc in Kerala as 1,569 new persons were diagnosed positive for the pandemic in the last 24 hours ending Friday 6 pm. The situation in the State is so grave that Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and seven of his Cabinet colleagues have gone under self-quarantine on Friday. The Ministers who have gone under quarantine include K K Shylaja, Health Minister. Ten persons succumbed to Covid 19 on Friday while 1,354 out of the new 1,569 cases contracted the pandemic through social transmission. 86 patients who tested positive on Friday failed to pinpoint the source from where they contracted the pandemic. Interestingly, Shylaja had said in a release on Thursday that Kerala is likely to see the number of Covid-19 cases going up to 10,000 to 20,000 per day in the coming weeks and the number of causalities too would go up along with it. Loknath Behera, State Police Chief too went under quarantine on Friday as he had accompanied the Chief Minister in the latter’s trip to Kozhikode and Munnar recently. The responsibility of Covid-19 management has been given to the Police Department by the Chief Minister on Wednesday as all measures to fight and control the pandemic has come a cropper in the State. The SP of Malappuram too went under self quarantine as the district collector too was tested positive on Friday.

# Don’t know who benefited from Modi’s ₹20L cr Covid package: Maha Cong chief

# Goa housing societies stigmatising patients, warned

Goa Health Minister Vishwajit Rane on Friday warned of a crackdown on housing societies and colonies discriminating against asymptomatic Covid-19 patients who have opted for home isolation. Rane said that his Ministry has been receiving complaints about various housing societies and other residential complexes stigmatising asymptomatic Covid-19 patients, including restricting supply of food to those in home isolation. “You cannot stigmatise patients who are opting for home isolation, otherwise government will come down heavily and take action against these housing societies and colonies. I have received complaints that committees are not allowing access to those who are in home isolation in different societies,” Rane said. “Supply of food is being stopped at the gates, as a result it is creating problems for patients who are asymptomatic and under monitoring of the Indian Medical Association and Health services. These people should not be stigmatised,” Rane said. The Health Minister said that Covid-19 could affect anyone. “Covid does not recognise caste, status is society. Anybody can become Covid positive. There should not be any kind of stigmatisation. Home isolation decision has to be respected. No society or colony can take these decisions on its own,” Rane said.

# CONG WINS RAJ TRUST

Mocking Gehlot for keeping his loyalists holed up in hotels for a month, he said if the Government had a majority it could have proven it earlier. He also questioned the Congress Government over the deployment of the state police at hotels where the MLAs were staying. A lot of rumours have been laid to rest through our united show today. I am sure that the Congress high command will, in a time-bound manner, roll out the roadmap and dealt with issues raised by us appropriately. The Opposition tried to unsettle us by highlighting issues like my seating arrangement. It is a non-issue. Till my last breath I will work for Rajasthan,” Pilot told the media outside the Assembly after the trust vote.

# I AM THE STRONGEST WARRIOR OF CONG, AVOWS SACHIN PILOT

The notice was sent to Pilot after the Rajasthan Police claimed to have stumbled upon a plot to topple the Congress government. “They are taking my name repeatedly. in the hyper sensitive areas, the ITBP said. Four personnel of the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) also posthumously secured the honours of Shaurya Chakra. The CISF personnel who have been awarded the Shaurya Chakra posthumously are Late Mahaveer Prasad, Sub Inspector, Late Eranna Nayaka, Head Constable and Late Constables Mahendra Kumar Paswan Satish Prasad. Meanwhile, Inspector Mohan Sharma of the Delhi Police has also been awarded a gallantry medal posthumously for his gallant action in the Batla House encounter in the national Capital in which he made the supreme sacrifice. The Union Home Ministry announced a total of 926 medals for various police forces and Central paramilitary forces. President Ram Nath Kovind, who is also the Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces, has approved 84 awards and decorations to the Armed Forces personnel and members of the Paramilitary Forces. The awards include one Kirti Chakra, nine Shaurya Chakras (four went to the CISF), five Bar to Sena Medals (Gallantry), 60 Sena Medals (Gallantry), four Nao Sena Medals (Gallantry) and five Yayu Sena Medals (Gallantry). The President has also approved 19 Mention-in-Despatches to the Army Personnel for their significant contributions in different military operations which include eight posthumous for “Operation Meghdoot” and “Operation Rakshak”.

# COVID 2.5 MN AND COUNTING

The coronavirus tally shot up to 2,73,085 in Andhra Pradesh as 8,943 fresh cases were reported in the last 24 hours. The State also registered 97 more coronavirus deaths, taking the overall toll to 2,475. The cases case rise in East Godavari district continued at an alarming rate as another 1,146 were added in the last 24 hours, pushing its gross to 38,292. Chittoor recorded 987 cases in the last 24 hours and Kurnool registered 956 COVID-19 cases. Tamil Nadu reported 5,890 new COVID-19 cases and 117 deaths in the last 24 hours taking the total number of cases to 3,26,245 including 5,514 deaths and 53,716 active cases. Chennai, which reported a decline in numbers, suffering a spike again with 1,187 new cases. During the past few days the city had been reporting less than 1,000 new infections. The districts of Chengalpeta and Thiruvallur have reported over 400 cases each, while Coimbatore, Kancheepuram, Theni have reported over 300, and Cuddalore reported 221 cases. The rest are from other districts of Tamil Nadu. With 7,908 new cases and 104 fatalities in the last 24 hours, taking the total tally to 2,11,108, including 1,28,182 cases of discharge and 3,717 deaths. More than half of Karnataka’s cases are in Bengaluru, while Mysuru, Bellary, Kalaburgi and Dakshin Kannada are the other badly affected districts.

# SC HOLDS PRASHANT BHUSHAN GUILTY OF CONTEMPT OF COURT

The bench said the company has also shown its bona fides immediately after the cognizance was taken by this Court as it has suspended both the tweets. “We, therefore, discharge the notice issued to the alleged contemnor No.2. (Twitter Inc),” the bench said. The top court said it would hear on August 20, the arguments on the quantum of sentence to be awarded to Bhushan in the matter. A contemnor in this case can be punished with simple imprisonment of up to six months or with a fine of up to ₹2,000 or with both. The bench analysed the two tweets of Bhushan posted on the micro-blogging site on June 27 on the functioning of judiciary in past six years, and on July 22 with regard to Chief Justice of India S A Bobde. “In our considered view, it cannot be said that the tweets can be said to be a fair criticism of the functioning of the judiciary, made bona fide in the public interest,” it said. An attempt to shake the very foundation of constitutional democracy has to be dealt with an iron hand, the bench said,

adding that the June 27 tweet (on judiciary) has the effect of destabilising the very foundation of this important pillar of the Indian democracy. “The scurrilous/malicious attacks by the alleged contemnor No.1 are not only against one or two judges but the entire Supreme Court in its functioning of the last six years. Such an attack which tends to create disaffection and disrespect for the authority of this Court cannot be ignored,” the bench said. “The tweet clearly tends to give an impression that the Supreme Court, which is the highest constitutional court in the country, has in the last six years played a vital role in the destruction of Indian democracy. There is no manner of doubt, that the tweet tends to shake the public confidence in the institution of judiciary,” the bench said. It said, “In our considered view, the said tweet undermines the dignity and authority of the institution of the Supreme Court of India and the CJI and directly affronts the majesty of law”. The bench said Bhushan who has been part of the institution of administration of justice for the last 30 years, “instead of protecting the majesty of law has indulged into an act, which tends to bring disrepute to the institution of administration of justice”. “The alleged contemnor No.1 is expected to act as a responsible officer of this court. The scurrilous allegations, which are malicious in nature and have the tendency to scandalize the court, are not expected from a person, who is a lawyer of 30 years standing,” it said. Referring to the July 22 tweet on CJI, about riding an alleged Rs 50 lakh motorcycle belonging to a BJP leader at Raj Bhawan, Nagpur “at a time when he keeps the SC in lockdown mode denying citizens their fundamental rights to access justice”, the bench said the first part could be said to be a criticism made against the CJI as an individual but not the second part.

The bench said it would be noted that the date on which the CJI is alleged to have taken a ride on a motorbike is during the period when the Supreme Court was on a summer vacation and the vacations Benches of the Court were regularly functioning. “The impression that the said tweet intends to give is that the CJI as the head of the Indian judiciary has kept the Supreme Court in lockdown mode, thereby denying citizens their fundamental right to access justice. In any case, the statement that the Supreme Court is in lockdown is factually incorrect even to the knowledge of the alleged contemnor No.1,” it said. It said that Bhushan has himself appeared on various occasions in a number of matters through video conferencing and referred to the matter in which order was passed. “In this premise, making such wild allegations, thereby giving an impression that the CJI is enjoying riding an expensive bike, while he keeps the SC in lockdown mode and thereby denying citizens their fundamental right to access justice is undoubtedly false, malicious and scandalous,” the bench said. The apex court had on August 5 reserved its verdict in the matter after Bhushan defended his tweets, saying they were against the judges regarding their conduct in their personal capacity and they did not obstruct administration of justice.

# DON'T EXCEED YOUR BRIEF ON SEALING IN DELHI, SC WARNS

The bench, also comprising Justices BR Gavai and Krishna Murari, quashed the monitoring committee’s April 2019 report, action of sealing and also the notices issued directing demolition “where the matter was being heard by this court and the monitoring committee had no power to look into the matter and to take any action”. The top court said it would not be appropriate for the committee to “usurp statutory powers” and act beyond the authority conferred upon it by the top court. While referring to an April last year report submitted by the committee regarding specific unauthorised constructions allegedly carried out in Delhi’s Vasant Kunj and Rajokari areas, the bench said the panel could neither have sealed residential premises, which were not misused for commercial purpose, nor could have directed their demolition.







# US will collapse if Biden is elected Prez: Trump

**Washington:** President Donald Trump has said that the US would collapse and become the world's laughing stock if the Democratic Party's presumptive nominee Joe Biden wins the November 3 presidential elections.

Trump said Biden's proposed policies were not good for the country.

"Today, we saw Joe Biden continue to politicise a pandemic and to show his appalling lack of respect for the American people. That's what it is. At every turn, Biden has been wrong about the virus, ignoring the scientific evidence and putting left-wing politics before facts and evidence," Trump told reporters on Thursday at the White House.

"The world will be laughing and taking full advantage of the United States if Joe Biden ever became President. Our Country would COLLAPSE!" Trump said in a tweet.

Trump's tweet included a Fox News video clipping in which its news anchor was crit-

ical of Indian-American Congresswoman Pramila Jayapal for praising Biden. The Fox News anchor described Jayapal as socialist and a genuine radical.

"Sleepy Joe opposed both the China and the Europe travel bans. You know that. He opposed the China travel ban that I instituted very early and the Europe travel ban that I instituted quite early. If I listened to his advice, hundreds of thousands more people would have died. This is according to many people," the president said.

Trump alleged Biden wants to fling open American borders, allowing the pandemic to infiltrate every American community. "He wants to have ridiculous open borders. I've been saying from the first day I started campaigning for this great office that if you have open borders, you don't have a country. You don't have a country, with open borders. So he wants open borders. The Democrats want open borders," he said.

While Biden will allow riot-

ers, looters and millions of illegal aliens to roam free in our country, he also wants the federal government to issue a sweeping new mandate to law-abiding citizens, Trump alleged.

"He wants the President of the United States, with the mere stroke of a pen, to order over 300 million American citizens to wear a mask for a minimum of three straight months. He thinks it's good politics. Different states are different, both in terms of the atmosphere and also in terms of the coronavirus problem," he said.

"If the President has the unilateral power to order every single citizen to cover their face in nearly all instances, what other powers does he have," Trump asked. The president alleged that Biden rejects the scientific approach in favour of locking all Americans in their basements for months on end.

"We've been dealing pretty strongly over the last number of weeks. But he wants them in the basement for months on end," he said. **PTI**

# Nepal's ruling CPN forms 6-member task force to resolve party rift

**Kathmandu:** The ruling Nepal Communist Party on Friday formed a six-member task force to resolve the intra-party rift to Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli and the party's executive chairman Pushpa Kamal Dahal 'Prachanda' resumed their talks after a hiatus of over a week.

The taskforce, led by General Secretary Bishnu Poudel, will recommend ways to sort out the differences in the party after Prachanda and senior leader Madhav Kumar Nepal demanded Prime Minister Oli's resignation.

The task force also has Standing Committee members Shankar Pokhrel, Janardan Sharma, Bhim Rawal, Surendra Pandey and Pampha Bhusal, according to party sources.

The decision to form the task force was taken after a meeting between Oli and Prachanda on Friday.

The two leaders resumed their talks on Thursday and held a one-on-one meeting at the

Prime Minister's residence at Baluwatar in Kathmandu to sort out their differences and resolve the intra-party rift. This was their first meeting after over a week.

Oli during a television interview on Wednesday said that the ongoing intra-party tussle will be settled within five days.

Oli and Prachanda have held several meetings to sort out the differences between them. But, as the Prime Minister did not accept the condition of a one-man-one-post, the talks failed. Oli has refused to give up his post as prime minister as well as a co-chairman of the NCP.

A bitter internal feud has been brewing in the ruling NCP after top party leaders, including Prachanda, demanded Oli's resignation, saying his recent anti-India remarks were "neither politically correct nor diplomatically appropriate." They are also against Oli's autocratic style of functioning. **PTI**

# Kabul begins release of final 400 Taliban, talks to follow

**Kabul:** Afghanistan has released the first 80 of a final 400 Taliban prisoners, paving the way for negotiations between the warring sides in Afghanistan's protracted conflict, the government said Friday.

Javid Faisal, spokesman for the National Security Council's office, made the announcement.

Taliban officials, speaking on condition of anonymity because they are not authorised to speak to the media, said 86 prisoners were freed. It wasn't immediately known when the remaining prisoners would be freed.

Prisoner releases on both sides are part of an agreement signed in February between the US and Taliban. It calls for the release of 5,000 Taliban held by the government and 1,000 government and military personnel held by the insurgent group as a good will gesture ahead of intra-Afghan negotiations.

Talks are expected to be held in Qatar where the Taliban maintain a political office. Several Afghan leaders told The Associated Press talks could begin by August 20.

These negotiations are to lay out a framework for a post-war Afghanistan.

Washington's peace envoy Zalmay Khalilzad spent a year-and-a-half negotiating the peace deal aimed at allowing American troops to return home and end America's longest military engagement.

US troops have already begun leaving and by

November less than 5,000 troops are expected to still be in Afghanistan down from nearly 13,000 when the agreement was signed Feb. 29.

American and NATO troop withdrawal is contingent on the Taliban keeping their commitment not to allow militant groups to use Afghanistan against the United States or its allies. The withdrawal is not tied to successful talks between the warring sides.

Last weekend, Afghan President Ashraf Ghani held a traditional council meeting known as loya jirga to get a consensus on the release of a final 400 Taliban he said were accused of serious crimes, saying without explanation that he could not unilaterally decide to release them. **AP**

# Letting Iran arms embargo expire is 'nuts': Pompeo

**Vienna:** US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo on Friday urged an extension to a UN arms embargo on Iran, saying it would be "nuts" to let it expire.

Opposition from UN Security Council veto powers China and Russia is expected to block a resolution to extend the blockade beyond October.

Pompeo reiterated during a visit to Vienna that Iran should not be allowed to buy and sell weapons, calling the Islamic Republic "the world's largest state sponsor of terrorism".

"I mean that's just nuts... We're urging the whole world to join us" to extend the arms embargo, he said.

As things stand arms sanctions are set to be eased gradually from October, under a Security Council resolution blessing a 2015 deal Iran signed with world powers to limit its ability to develop a nuclear bomb -- in exchange for easing trade barriers.

The landmark deal has come under strain since the US pulled out of it in 2018.

As Washington has re-imposed crippling sanctions, Tehran has in turn stepped up its nuclear activities again since

last year.

Pompeo urged Tehran to provide "full, transparent and immediate cooperation" with the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), which monitors Iran's compliance with the nuclear deal.

Stepping up enrichment After meeting Pompeo on Friday, IAEA Director General Rafael Grossi told reporters that Iran had still not granted the agency access to two sites where it has requested access in order to clarify questions about possible undeclared nuclear activity in the early 2000s. **AFP**

# China attacks new US demand to register Confucius Institutes

**Beijing:** China accused the United States on Friday of trying to "demonise and stigmatise" relations between the two countries, in a scathing attack on the Trump administration's designation of Chinese-funded language and culture programmes in the US as foreign missions of the Chinese Communist Party.

Foreign ministry spokesperson Zhao Lijian said branches of the Confucius Institute US Centre operating at US schools and colleges are a "bridge and link to help peo-

ple from all over the world learn Chinese, understand China, and strengthen educational and cultural exchanges and cooperation between China and other countries."

Zhao said the accusations against the institutes were without basis and were motivated by "ideological prejudice and self-interest."

"The relevant US approach is to demonise and stigmatise the normal operation of China-US cooperation projects. We strongly deplore and oppose it," Zhao said at a daily briefing. **AP**

# Officials: US seizes Iranian gas heading for Venezuela

**Miami (US):** The Trump administration has seized the cargo of four tankers it was targeting for transporting Iranian fuel to Venezuela, U.S. Officials said Thursday, as it steps up its campaign of maximum pressure against the two heavily sanctioned allies.

Last month, federal prosecutors in Washington filed a civil forfeiture complaint alleging that the sale was arranged by a businessman, Mahmoud Madanipour, with ties to Iran's Revolutionary Guard Corps, a U.S.-designated foreign terrorist organization.

At the time, sanctions experts thought it would be

impossible to enforce the U.S. Court order in international waters.

A senior U.S. Official told The Associated Press that no military force was used in the seizures and that the ships weren't physically confiscated.

Rather, US Officials threatened ship owners, insurers and captains with sanction to force them to hand over their cargo, which now becomes US Property, the official said. Prosecutors alleged the 4 ships were transporting to Venezuela 1.1 million barrels of gasoline. But the tankers never arrived at the South American country and then went missing. **AP**

# 11 killed, 27 missing in rain-triggered landslides in Nepal

**Kathmandu:** Powerful landslides triggered by torrential rains hit central Nepal's Sindhupalchowk district on Friday, killing at least 11 people and leaving 27 others missing, an official said.

The landslides hit Jugal Rural Municipality of Sindhupalchowk district, 130 kilometers east of Kathmandu on Friday morning.

Five people who sustained serious injuries have been airlifted by the Nepal Army in a helicopter and brought to the district headquarters where they are undergoing treatment, the official said. **PTI**

# Thousands flood Belarus capital as protests grow

**Minsk (AP):** Tens of thousands of people flooded the heart of the Belarus capital of Minsk on Friday in a show of anger over a brutal police crackdown this week on peaceful protesters that followed a disputed election, as authorities sought to ease rising public fury by freeing at least 2,000 who were jailed after earlier demonstrations.

Factory workers marched across the city shouting "Go away!" in a call for authoritarian President Alexander Lukashenko to resign after 26 years of iron-fisted rule that was extended in an election Sunday that protesters denounced as rigged.

Friday's crowds grew to more than 20,000, filling central Independence Square.

About a dozen soldiers guarding the nearby government headquarters lowered their riot shields in what the demonstrators saw as a sign of solidarity, and women rushed to embrace and kiss the guards.

Earlier, police didn't interfere as the protesters marched across the city, reflecting Lukashenko's apparent attempt to assuage the opposition by stepping back from the violent police crackdowns seen across the country earlier this week.

The release by the Interior Ministry of about 2,000 of the nearly 7,000 people detained was seen as another move to defuse popular outrage. It said more would be freed.

Many who were released spoke of brutal beatings and other abuse by police, and some showed bruises on their bodies. Some of them wept as

they embraced waiting relatives.

Demonstrators have swarmed the streets ever since Sunday's election in which officials reported that Lukashenko won 80% of the vote to win a sixth term in office.

His main challenger, Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya, who fled on Tuesday to neighboring Lithuania, posted a new video

in which she disputed the results of the vote and demanded that the government start a dialogue with demonstrators.

European Union foreign ministers are due to meet to discuss possible sanctions against Belarus over the ferocious crackdown that left hundreds injured since Sunday as police have dispersed the largely peaceful demonstrations

with stun grenades, tear gas, rubber bullets and severe beatings. At least one person has been killed.

Thousands of factory workers who previously formed the core of Lukashenko's base have joined the protests, denouncing the police crackdown and demanding a new election, raising the prospect of a nationwide strike.

"Our entire shop voted against Lukashenko and then we suddenly learned that he won by a landslide," 42-year-old assembly worker Dmitry Glukhovskiy said outside the Minsk Automobile Plant, or MAZ.

"They not only have cheated us but also beaten us up, and no one is going to accept that."

# Iran, Turkey lash out at UAE over agreement with Israel

**Tehran:** Iran and Turkey lashed out at their regional rival the United Arab Emirates on Friday over its decision to normalise diplomatic relations with Israel in a US-brokered deal, accusing it of betraying the Palestinian cause.

Iran's Foreign Ministry called the deal a "dagger that was unjustly struck by the UAE in the backs of the Palestinian people and all Muslims."

Turkey said the peoples of the region "will never forget and will never forgive this hypocritical behaviour" by the UAE.

The UAE, which has never fought Israel and has quietly been improving ties for years, said the agreement put a hold

on Israel's plans to unilaterally annex parts of the occupied West Bank, which the Palestinians view as the heartland of their future state.

But the Turkish Foreign Ministry said the UAE had no authority to negotiate with Israel on behalf of the Palestinians or "to make concessions on matters vital to Palestine." **AP**

# Palestinians say UAE deal hinders quest for Mideast peace

**Jerusalem:** Israel's agreement to establish diplomatic ties with the United Arab Emirates marks a watershed moment in its relations with Arab countries, but the Palestinians say it puts a just resolution of the Middle East conflict even further out of reach.

The UAE presented its decision to upgrade long-standing ties to Israel as a way of encouraging peace efforts by taking Israel's planned annexation of parts of the occupied West Bank off the table, something Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu swiftly rebuffed by insisting the pause was "temporary."

From the Palestinian perspective, the UAE not only failed to stop annexation, which would dash any remaining hopes of establishing a viable, independent state. It also undermined an Arab consensus that recognition of Israel only come in return for concessions in peace talks — a rare source of leverage for the Palestinians.

"I never expected this poison dagger to come from an Arab country," Saeb Erekat, a senior Palestinian official and veteran negotiator said Friday. "You are rewarding aggression. ... You have destroyed, with this move, any possibility of peace between Palestinians and Israelis."

President Donald Trump has presented the US-brokered agreement as a major diplomatic achievement and said he expects more Arab and Muslim countries to follow suit.

Israel has quietly cultivated ties with the UAE and other Gulf countries for several years as they have confronted a shared enemy in Iran.

In Israel, the agreement has renewed long-standing hopes for normal relations with its Arab neighbors.

Netanyahu has long insisted, contrary to generations of failed peace negotiators, that Israel can enjoy such ties without resolving its conflict with the Palestinians. For now, he seems to have been proven right. "It's hard to claim right now that the 53-year-old occupation is 'unsustainable' when Netanyahu has just proved that not only is it sustainable, but Israel can improve its ties with the Arab world, openly, with the occupation still going," wrote Anshel Pfeffer, a columnist for Israel's Haaretz newspaper.

But the Middle East conflict was never between Israel and the United Arab Emirates, which have fought no wars and share no borders.

And the nature of the agreement will likely force the Palestinians to harden their stance and redouble their efforts to isolate Israel.

The Palestinian Authority issued a scathing statement in response to the move, calling it a "betrayal of Jerusalem, Al-Aqsa Mosque and the Palestinian cause," language clearly aimed at inflaming Arab and Muslim sentiment worldwide. The Palestinians have called for an urgent meeting of the Arab League and the 57-member Organization of Islamic Cooperation to condemn the move.

But in those forums they will be pitted against the oil-rich UAE, which has deep pockets, allies across the region and even more influence in Washington following the agreement with Israel.

The international campaign is "meant to isolate the Emiratis so that other countries will not take the same step," said Ibrahim Dalalsha, a Palestinian analyst. "Whether it will succeed in this or not, it remains to be seen."

# New Zealand extends Auckland lockdown

**Wellington (AP):** New Zealand's government on Friday extended a lockdown of its largest city Auckland for another 12 days as it tries to stamp out its first domestic coronavirus outbreak in more than three months.

The outbreak has grown to 30 people and extended beyond Auckland for the first time.

Until the cluster was discovered Tuesday, New Zealand had gone 102 days without infections spreading in the community. The only known cases were travelers quarantined after arriving from abroad.

Health authorities believe the virus must have been reintroduced from overseas, but genome testing hasn't found a link with any of the quarantined travelers.

That has prompted authorities to investigate whether shipping workers were a source, after several employees at a food storage facility were infected.

Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern said extending the Auckland lockdown, which began Wednesday, would give authorities time to get a handle on the virus cluster and isolate those infected.

"Together, we have got rid of COVID before," Ardern said in a highly anticipated address.

"We have kept it out for 102 days, longer than any other country. We have been world-leading in our COVID response, with the result that many lives were saved and our economy was getting going faster than almost anywhere else. We can do all of that again."

All of the new cases in the outbreak appear to be linked through family or work connections. The only known infections outside Auckland are two people in the central

North Island town of Tokoroa who were visited by infected family members from Auckland. Officials said they thought the chances were low the virus would spread further in Tokoroa.

Several of those infected work at an Americold food storage facility in the Auckland suburb of Mt. Wellington.

Officials are looking at the possibility that workers on a freight ship or at the port may have spread the infections, despite physical distancing requirements at those sites and orders preventing ship workers coming ashore.

Director-General of Health Ashley Bloomfield said they were doing rigorous testing at Auckland's port "as part of our investigation just to follow that chain of the Americold goods that might have come in through the port and been transported to that Mt. Wellington depot."

Officials are also investigating the possibility the virus could have survived from abroad on chilled or frozen food boxes and then infected workers in New Zealand, a scenario they consider unlikely.

# 'A LOVE LETTER TO HUMAN RACE'

Presenter BRIAN COX says that the series, *Human Universe*, explores the answers to the greatest questions ever asked about the existence of planets, alien life and the human brain. By TEAM VIVA

It is a story of humankind, told through the greatest questions ever asked. 'Where are we in the Universe?' 'What is the destiny of our planet?' 'How did the human brain arise and why did we develop consciousness?' 'Will our search for alien life be successful, or Earth is the only planet with life? Are we alone?'

Answering these questions, the series, *Human Universe* offers a new perspective on human life, combining dramatic photography with innovative CGI all set in spectacular locations across the world as it explores the ultimate wonder of the universe — us.

Excerpts of a conversation with presenter Brian Cox:

#### ◆How would you sum up the series?

*Human Universe* is a love letter to the human race. It sounds like a very simple definition of a series but it didn't begin that simply. It started out as a cosmology series, an astronomy series, asking questions about how we came here, questions about the evolution of the human race, the origin of the Universe itself. Well, what we realised during the shoot was that, it was, it really became a series about our values.

Modern science has taught us that we are very rare as well as insignificant, and so the trick in the series was to put those two things together — what does it mean to be rare, and then, the consequence of an almost unbelievable series of accidents, but also insignificant. How do you marry these things?

The answers were — our rarity gives us value and also, because our existence seems to be completely meaningless, we're equally insignificant. We didn't have to be here. Hence, I think we have a responsibility to look after ourselves, to protect ourselves, to find out about the Universe, and to do science.



In this way, if you put all these thoughts together, ultimately, you get a love letter.

#### ◆What's special about the series?

I think of all the series I've made, this one is my favourite. I have a soft spot for the 'Wonders of the Solar System' because it's the first big thing that I did. And this one I think, for me, addresses the biggest questions. Undoubtedly, we're asking questions about, at one level, our existence, how did we come to be here, not only us as human beings, given the origin of life on Earth, but also the Universe itself. And the fact that modern, 21st century science is beginning to address these questions is remarkable.

At another level, it's also hinting at deeper questions like how to value ourselves and science, proceed for the future, and respect the acquisition of knowledge. This has been made most explicit in the fifth programme, which is polemic. Many would have seen it in the past through series like *Cosmos*, *The*

*Ascent of Man*, and some of James Burke's works. They have polemical elements.

I think this series is a bit old-fashioned, but in a good way. It has a collective opinion, which is delivered as mine but was actually generated throughout the series, through the collaboration with the crew and the directors, and everybody who worked on the series. I think that is what gives it some added depth and resonance.

#### ◆What was your most memorable experience during the shoot?

The strangest experience I've ever had filming anything was the Soyuz capsule return into Kazakhstan. The reason is that the snow there was quite heavy and our vehicles were very under-powered. Essentially, we had the wrong vehicles, so we couldn't get there and got stuck. It was a disaster because it's the centre part of the series — return of the Soyuz capsule into Kazakhstan — and we were faced with a situation where we couldn't film it because we

couldn't reach there.

A film crew working for the Russian Army said to us, 'We can fit two of you in our vehicle. If you jump on these two snowmobiles and chase us and see if you can find us out there in the Kazakh wilderness.' So, I and Paul O'Callahan, the cameraman, jumped onto the snowmobiles, left everybody else and went off with the Russian Army, with no communication with our team.

No one spoke English, apart from one of the Russian cameramen. We stayed the night, partly in a Kazakh farmer's hut, who, as far as I could see, brought us horse and jam to eat, which was actually very good. And we finally filmed the return of the Soyuz capsule. It was a remarkable experience. You will see it at the end of episode 1, *Ape Man Space Man*, in one of the most iconic scenes of the series, that only two of us actually shot it.

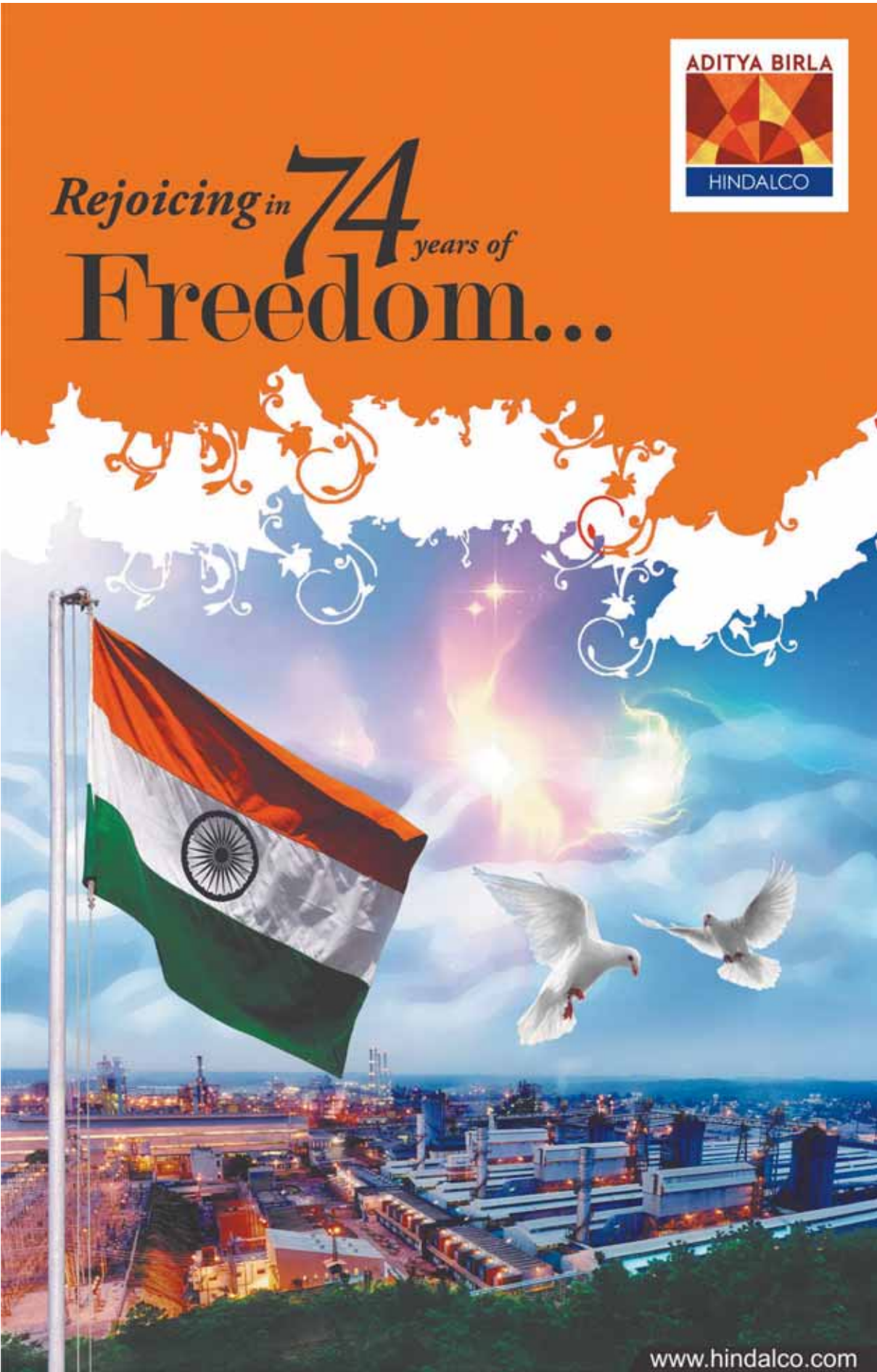

Super-sub Tyler Adams' maiden Leipzig strike helps Nagelsmann's side knock-out Atletico to reach CL semis

Leipzig stunned Atletico Madrid 2-1 on Thursday to reach the Champions League semi-finals for the first time as Tyler Adams' 88th-minute winner earned them a showdown with Paris Saint-Germain.

Atletico looked to have secured extra-time at the Estadio Jose Alvalade when Joao Felix won and then scored a penalty to cancel out Dani Olmo's headed opener early in the second half.

But Adams proved an unlikely hero for Leipzig, coming off the bench to snatch victory in Lisbon after his fired effort took a cruel deflection of Stefan Savic and flew in.

The win marks a historic night for Leipzig, who were

only formed 11 years ago and played their first-ever season in Germany's top flight in 2016.

Progress to the last four also puts another feather in the cap of their coach Julian Nagelsmann, whose stock will rise even further after ousting Diego Simeone, one of this competition's most gnarly tacticians.

"I'm perhaps one of the happiest coaches in the world," Nagelsmann said.

"We were the better team, the result is totally OK. The second goal is a bit lucky but we found the space behind the defensive line. I think we were the better team today."

Their challenge is now to defeat PSG on Tuesday, the

French champions who have only played three matches in almost half a year and needed a late escape to see off Atalanta on Tuesday.

"It's normal that when you get to the next round, you want more," Nagelsmann said.

"Tonight we're happy. Tomorrow we'll start looking at Paris. That will be another difficult game but we'll have a plan."

**'HURTS A LOT'**  
For Atletico and Simeone, this was an opportunity spurned to go far in Europe at the end of what has been a disappointing season in Spain.

After Real Madrid's loss against Manchester City, only

Barcelona are left to fly the Spanish flag in this tournament and they face a formidable challenge against Bayern Munich on Friday.

Questions will be asked again about the future of Simeone, who has struggled to recreate an Atletico side capable of challenging for major honours.

His notoriously defensive approach, which saw off holders Liverpool in the last 16, looked outdated here against the slick, quick and free-flowing style of their opponents.

"It hurts a lot," said Atletico's Saul Niguez. "They had superiority in many areas on the pitch, inside, outside. Many times we were not even close to stopping them."

## England, Germany & Spain book FIFA U-17 WWC tickets

Defending champions Spain, England and Germany were on Friday named for the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup to be held in India next year on the basis of their rankings after the European qualifying tournament was cancelled due to Covid-19 pandemic.

The Local Organising Committee (LOC) said in a media statement that the European governing body UEFA has "confirmed that

England, Germany and Spain will represent Europe in the upcoming FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup India 2021".

The three countries were selected after the UEFA U-17 Women's Championship was cancelled due to the pandemic.

"The final round of UEFA U-17 Women's Championship has been cancelled because of the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. Three teams with the highest coefficient ranking have been confirmed as the participants in the World Cup," the

statement said.

Spain, England and Germany will now join hosts India, North Korea, Japan and New Zealand, who have already qualified for the tournament.

Spain had won the 2018 edition of the tournament after beating Mexico 2-1 in the final in Uruguay.

The tournament was originally to be held in October-November this year but pushed to 2021 (February 17 to March 7). The final will be played at the D Y Patil stadium in Navi Mumbai.

## Rizwan leads Pak fight back

Mohammad Rizwan scored a gritty, unbeaten half-century to guide Pakistan past 200 against an increasingly frustrated England before the teams were forced off because of bad light before tea on the second day of the second Test on Friday.

Pakistan was 215-8 at the enforced end of the session, with Rizwan on 53 and Mohammad Abbas on 2.

England looked like wrapping up the Pakistan innings after star batsman Babar Azam (47) edged behind a brilliant ball from Stuart Broad that seamed and squared up Babar.

That made the score 158-6 and two more wickets fell for 18 runs, with Yasir Shah (5) flashing at a delivery from Jimmy Anderson and edging to give wicketkeeper Jos Buttler another catch before Shaheen Afridi (0) was run out by Dom Sibley at the non-striker's end after a mix-up.

England's seam bowling unraveled in the final half-hour, with the field set by captain Joe Root perhaps too negative under threatening skies and with two lower-order batsmen in the middle. On



occasions, there were five or six out near the boundary as Root spread the field.

Anderson has the best bowling figures, with 3-48. The tourists trail 1-0 in the three-match series after losing the first match by three wickets in Manchester. Another victory for England will clinch a first Test series against Pakistan in 10 years, and a second series of this pandemic-affected summer having already beaten the West Indies.

## Willian joins Arsenal

Arsenal have signed Brazil midfielder Willian on a three-year deal after the 32-year-old's contract with Chelsea expired.

The 32-year-old forward is an experienced player and has

made more than 600 club appearances in a career spanning 13 seasons. He has played in leagues all over the world and Arsenal will be hoping he can given them a big boost next season. Willian started at Brazilian side Corinthians, before joining Shakhtar Donetsk in August

2007. In his six years there, he won four Ukrainian Premier League titles and the UEFA Cup in 2009. Four years later, he briefly signed for Anzhi Makhachkala before joining Chelsea, winning the Premier League and League Cup in his second season in England.

## Aussies confirm white-ball England tour

Australia's limited-overs tour of England will go ahead this month at bio-secure venues, officials said on Friday, after its players were given Government clearance to travel.

The confirmation ensures Australians will pad up for their

first internationals in nearly six months, with Glenn Maxwell, Nathan Lyon and Marcus Stoinis recalled to the squad, while Usman Khawaja and Travis Head missed out.

Australia was originally scheduled to play three one-day and three T20 matches against England in July, but the trip was

postponed due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Detailed biosecurity plans have now been agreed to ensure it can go ahead, including Government exemptions, which are required for Australians to leave the country. The team has also agreed to self-quarantine for 14 days on their return.

They depart from Perth on August 23 en route to Derby ahead of four practice matches — three T20s and a one-dayer — before three T20s and three one-day internationals in Southampton and Old Trafford, which have hotels on site.

Australia named a 21-man squad with Maxwell, Lyon and

Stoinis among notable inclusions, along with three debutants — Josh Philippe, Daniel Sams and Riley Meredith.

But there was no room for Head, Khawaja, Michael Neser, Ben McDermott or D'Arcy Short, who were all named in a preliminary 26-man squad last month.
