In the morning, reflecting Gehlot's hard stand, Rajasthan Speaker issued notices to Pilot and 18 other rebel Congress MLAs after the party sought their disqualification...

The MLAs had defied a whip and did not attend its legislature party meetings held on Monday and Tuesday.

"Notices have been issued to 19 rebel MLAs, including



Sachin Pilot, yesterday, Speaker CP Joshi said.

Sources said the notices were sent after the chief whip of the Congress in Rajasthan Assembly, Mahesh Joshi, wrote to the Speaker, seeking proceedings against the rebel MLAs in accordance with the 10th Schedule of the Constitution.

The Congress also cited past Supreme Court rulings to seek their disqualification. Notices have been sent to all rebels through e-mail and WhatsApp.

Among those sent notices are Vishvendra Singh and Ramesh Meena, who were sacked along with Pilot from the State Cabinet after their rebellion against Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot.

Earlier, in separate statements to media channels Sachin said that there was no truth in the rumours of him joining the BJP. He said that he had worked very hard to defeat the saffron party in the Assembly elections...

Hobson's choice for Pilot: Homecoming

Rebel Congress leader Sachin Pilot is now left with few options but to climb down after several MLAs close to him opposed any truck with the BJP and risk their membership of the Assembly after they were served disqualification notice by the Rajasthan Speaker.

Making this difficult for Pilot is Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot, who is opposed to the efforts mooted by the Central leadership to bring back pilot once again in the "Congress family".

After his unceremonious exit as Rajasthan Deputy CM and State PCC president, it will

be interesting to see whether Pilot turns this rebellion into a turning point in his political career. One of the options before him is to accept a compromise formula to be back as PCC chief.

And there he can also have a major say in the next panchayat elections in State politics. It's unlikely that Pilot will like to be back in the Government and work under Gehlot any more as Deputy Chief Minister.

Another option for Pilot is to form a regional outfit with his loyalists, challenging both the Congress and the BJP in the next elections in Rajasthan, a State, which traditionally has, for at least the last two decades, witnessed the consecutive rule of the BJP and the Congress.

Pilot has a stronghold on the Meena-Gujjar community and both communities have 8

per cent vote shares each in the State. In eastern Rajasthan, the Congress won several seats in the 2018 Assembly elections because of the support of both these two communities.

Another possibility, which though Pilot has denied, is to get in touch with the BJP and break a sizeable number of MLAs to head a BJP-led Government.

But this option is not likely to be a cakewalk for Pilot. The likes of former Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje, veteran leader Gulabchand Kataria, State party president Satish Poonia are unlikely to agree on Pilot as one of the CM candidates.

Raje will be an important factor for the BJP before it considers including Pilot in the party. Despite the electoral losses, Vasundhara continues to command Rajasthan BJP with a stronghold.

Trump's U-turn on visa policy, Indians relieved

The Trump administration has agreed to rescind its July 6 rule, which temporarily barred international students from staying in the United States unless they attend at least one in-person course...

The U-turn by the Trump administration comes following a nationwide outrage against its July 6 order and a series of lawsuits filed by a large number of educational institutions, led by the prestigious Harvard University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT)...

As many as 17 US states and the District of Columbia, along with top American IT companies such as Google, Facebook and Microsoft, joined MIT and Harvard in the US District Court in Massachusetts against the DHS and the ICE in seeking an injunction to stop the entire rule from going into effect.

"I have been informed by the parties that they have come to a resolution. They will return



to the status quo," Judge Allison Burroughs, the federal district judge in Boston, said in a surprise statement at the top of the hearing on the lawsuit.

The announcement comes as a big relief to international students, including from India.

In the 2018-2019 academic year, there were over 10 lakh international students in the US. According to a recent report of the Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP), 1,94,556 Indian students were enrolled in various academic institutions in the US in January.

Judge Burroughs said the policy would apply nationwide. "Both the policy directive and the frequently asked questions would not be enforced anyplace," she said, referring to the agreement between the US government and MIT and Harvard.

"The Administration needs to give us a plan to tackle our public health crisis — it can't be recklessly creating rules one day and rescinding them the next," he said in a tweet.

Jharkhand Cong alleges BJP trying Op Lotus, luring MLAs

State Congress chief and Jharkhand Finance Minister Rameshwar Oraon has claimed that the BJP is continuing its 'Operation Lotus' in the State to topple JMM-Congress-RJD Government and has tried to lure at least four Congress legislators in its fold with "gift".

Accusing State BJP, the State Congress president claimed that like Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, the BJP is working on a sinister plan.

He said that the BJP is trying to buy Congress MLAs by luring them. Oraon said, "The BJP is still to digest how the Congress and JMM were able to form the Government. Congress MLAs are being lured with ministerial berths and money."

Oraon said, "BJP doesn't believe in democracy and

always in move to destabilize an elected Government. Four Congress MLAs informed me that BJP leadership has approached them offering them money and post."

He further said that he has informed State Congress in-charge RPN Singh in this connection. The Congress president lashing out at the BJP leadership alleged that during Rajya Sabha elections too these four Congress MLAs were lured by the saffron party.

"BJP doesn't believe in democracy as the entire Country has seen how BJP was able to form government in Goa, Manipur and Madhya Pradesh. The Congress leadership has spoken to Chief Minister Hemant Soren on the issue," Oraon said.

Jharkhand Congress unit's fresh allegation has come at a time when there is political instability in Rajasthan.

The Ashok Gehlot Government in Rajasthan is facing rough weather with his deputy Sachin Pilot declaring open rebellion against the CM. Pilot has claimed the Gehlot government is in minority and that he has support of 30 Congress MLAs in the 200-member State Assembly. The Rajasthan episode has given a chance to the non NDA parties to attack BJP. Shiv Sena, BJP's friend turned foe today alleged that the Central power is working to destabilize (the state) Governments of its opponents.

Meanwhile, a Congress leader said that BJP is eyeing newly elected Congress legislators as they knew that it is difficult to break old party leaders. Sources said that there are half a dozen Congress legislators who are elected for the first time and the BJP is eyeing these MLAs.

Respect peace protocols at borders: India to China

After ensuring that troops have withdrawn from the stand-off sites at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Eastern Ladakh, India and China mutually agreed on modalities to implement the next phase of disengagement. In the 15-hour marathon talks, India also made it clear that all protocols for border management for maintaining peace have to be followed.

This was the fourth round of talks between the Corps Commanders Lt General Harinder Singh and Major General Liu Lin on Tuesday in Chushul, Ladakh, in the last one and a half months with the Indian side also insisting in the latest round that onus is on China to pull back speedily, sources said here on Wednesday.

Given the sensitive nature of talks, Army Chief General M M Naravane held at least two sessions of talks in New Delhi on Wednesday to analyse the par-



leys. He later briefed the top political leadership while senior commanders also apprised the China Study Group. This high-powered group comprises senior officials of Home, Defence and External Affairs Ministries.

In a related development, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will make an on the spot review of the situation on the LAC during a two-day visit starting July 17. The Army

in the western section of the disputed boundary.

The Chinese Foreign Ministry said it hoped New Delhi would work with Beijing to safeguard peace and tranquility in the border areas.

Responding to a query on the talks, Foreign Ministry spokesperson Hua Chunying said: "As I know on July 14, border troops of China and India held the fourth round of commander-level talks building on the consensus of the previous three rounds and the implementation of relevant work have reached progress on promoting further disengagement between troops at the western section of the boundary and de-escalating tensions."

"We hope India can work with China to implement our consensus with real actions and jointly safeguard peace and tranquility in the border areas," she said in her short response without sharing details or elaborating on the exact agenda of the talks.

Plasma therapy to be free for patients

Plasma therapy to treat Covid-19 patients began at three hospitals of the State on Wednesday and it would be available free of cost.

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik made the announcement while inaugurating the plasma bank at SCB Medical College Hospital in Cuttack through video conferencing.

The therapy, which uses the plasma from the blood of recovered patients to treat critically ill patients, began at SUM Hospital and KIMS Hospital in Bhubaneswar and Aswini Hospital in Cuttack. The SCB has been designated as the nodal centre for the therapy.

This therapy is expected to be an effective tool in our fight against the global Covid-19 pandemic. Our doctors in Government medical colleges have made the entire State proud by introducing this advanced medical procedure," the CM said while addressing the doctors.

"Our Government is committed to provide higher standard of medical care and treatment to the people of the State. No person in Odisha will be deprived of the latest medical technology," he added.

The CM appealed to all the virus survivors to come forward to donate their plasma which he believes would go a long way in helping in the treatment of serious patients. He congratulated four donors who have volunteered to donate plasma on the day.

"I would like to announce that the plasma therapy will be made available free of cost to the people of Odisha," Patnaik said.

3 more corona deaths; State toll now 77

The State reported three more Covid-19 deaths on Wednesday, taking the total toll to 77. While two deaths were reported from Ganjam district, Bhubaneswar recorded the other death.

The two in Ganjam were a 65-year-old man and a 86-year-old man, who were suffering from co-morbidities as well. The victim from Bhubaneswar was a 72-year-old man, the Health and Family Welfare Department said.

Meanwhile, there was a huge jump in positive cases on the day with as many as 618 cases, taking the State's overall tally to 14, 898. Out of the new cases, 411 cases were reported from quarantine centres and 207 infected with the disease locally. Ganjam district registered

Of the new cases, 63 were reported from various quarantine centres while 27 were local contact, the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) said.


With this, the total cases in Bhubaneswar surged to 859

with 462 active ones.

A 22-year-old employee of a private hospital, a 38-year-old woman of Chakeisiani, a 48-year-old man of Pokhariput Lingaraj Vihar, a 24-year-old woman of Hanspala, a 58-year-old woman of Rasulgarh, a 25-year-old man of Nageswar Tangi Ravi Talkies Square, a

Rangamatia also tested positive. Besides, seven cases of Salia Sahi Krsuhna Nagar, nine cases of a Government quarantine centre, 10 cases near the Pahala police outpost and nine cases of two Government quarantine centres were also reported positive.

The local contact cases included a 27-year-old man of BJB Nagar, a 26-year-old man of Jagamura, a 50-year-old man

of Ghatikia, a 62-year-old woman of Iaxmisagar, a 48-year-old man of Old Town, a 23-year-old man of Khandagiri, a 52-year-old man of Bharatpur, a 38-year-old man of Rasulgarh, a 31-year-old man of Chandrasekharpur, a 57-year-old man of Chandrasekharpur BDA Colony, a 40-year-old man of Biswera Basti, a 30-year-old man of Nayapalli Gajapati Nagar Basti, a 27-year-old man of Unit-IV MLA Colony, a seven-year-old girl of Gandamunda and two women of Baramunda Jagannath Nagar.

However, 24 patients recovered from the disease in the city.

In Cuttack city, four more persons tested positive, taking the total tally to 295 with 154 active cases.

The new cases included two institutional quarantine cases from the isolation ward of SCB Medical College Hospital, a home quarantine case and a local contact case.

Jobless ANMs to man Covid Care Homes

To be engaged on temporary basis

In view of the rising Covid-19 cases, the State Government has decided to appoint unemployed trained and registered ANMs (auxiliary nurses and midwives) for the proposed Covid Care Homes in gram panchayats.

As per an order issued by the Health & Family Welfare Department, as many as 7,000 trained personnel would be engaged temporarily in the Covid Care Homes covering the 6,798 panchayats of the State.

The base-level health activity in the Covid Care Homes would be managed by unemployed trained and registered ANMs.

As per the decision, at least one unemployed ANM would be employed per each

proposed Covid Care Home.

In case of unavailability of manpower in this category, unemployed registered staff nurses or pharmacists can be preferred to be engaged in place of ANMs.

The engagement is temporary for a period of three months only or till the Covid Care Homes are functional. The engagement is terminable at any period of time.

The CDMOs and PHOs would recruit the personnel through walk-in-interviews in a transparent manner. Each one engaged would be paid a remuneration of Rs 850 per day.

In case of non-availability of ANMs, trained staff nurses or pharmacists may be engaged alternatively with a daily remuneration of Rs 1,000.

The ANMs would be engaged as per number of Covid Care Homes to be opened in the respective district.

Plaint lodged on mining leasees' irregularities

Petition submitted

In a petition to Additional Chief Secretary RK Sharma, MASS, a people's organisation, brought to the notice of the Government, that mining leasees are adopting malpractices to obtain transit permit under the Orissa Minerals (Prevention of Theft, Smuggling and Illegal Mining and Regulation of Possession, Storage, Trading and Transportation) Rules.

Pointing out the lacuna in the present system of issuance of Transit Permit, MASS secretary Subrat Tripathy told that in many instances, the verification report of the concerned mining inspector is issued on the same date of submitting application in Form J. The average distance from mining circles to mining lease area is 10-50 km and it is difficult for a person to visit all these mines daily, inspect and issue reports on the same date. It has come to notice that the verification reports are issued online without site inspection of many

stacks, he alleged.

Lessees keep on transporting high grade material directly from the mines showing them as low grade stacked material. It invites malpractices in grade declaration in the chemical analysis report in Form K issued by the Government laboratory considering the strength of manpower, time in analysis of samples and issuance of reports. Further, there is a need for a physical verification of the samples which are required to be kept as umpire samples at concerned DDM office for future verifications.

In case of mineral transportation by railway wagon, samples of minerals shall be drawn by the person authorized by the concerned DDM office/Analytical chemist. The analysis of samples shall be done at Government laboratory. Considering large rake movement, it invites manipulation of grades wherever stacking permission has been granted, Tripathy said.

Many mines are transporting minerals under the provision of stacking. Present revenue collection of Rs 11,019 crore for all minerals in FY 19-20 would have been much higher if the under reporting of grade and royalty was prevented.

Tripathy urged the Government to check illegal transport and storage of minerals. Vigilance of mining and transport of mineral using drone technology should be adopted at the earliest. Inquiry must be initiated on position and movement of material from stacks, based on the Google map/image from Cartosat satellite as these are capable of showing movement of material stack wise for retrospective dates also. The Government must inquire about grant of transit permit on the same date of applying under Form J without actual field verification, he told.

The loss incurred to the State Government must be recovered from the lessees who have adopted the malpractices. Penal action may be initiated against few mines who do not even have space for stacking and sampling given their high EC capacity and the overall lease area.

'Reopen hospitals for non-Covid patients'

Samantara terms closure 'inhuman'

Lokshakti Abhiyan president Prafulla Samantara on Wednesday urged the Government to reopen District Headquarters Hospitals and medical colleges for treatment of patients other than Covid-infected persons soon.

In a letter to Chief Secretary Asit Tripathy, Samantara remarked, "It is inhuman to close district and medical college hospitals for treatment of serious patients

other than Covid19."

He mentioned that only emergency or casualty is opened without experts and senior doctors and no indoor patients are being allowed. Patients needing urgent treatment are returning without treatment and being left to die.

"This morning, Suryakanta Swain of Brahmapur University suffered from a paralytical attack and moved MKCG Medical College Casualty Department. But he did not find any doctor. His friends carrying him are moving street to street to get a doctor for his urgent treatment," wrote Samantara.

"It is unjustified that hospitals are closed on the plea that coronavirus is spreading and patients and doctors might get affected. There should be at least senior doctors and experts with pre-cautions present to see to needy patients and urged indoor patients need be admitted to save their life," wrote Samantara.

He wanted to know if the State Government or the district administrations have noticed how many people suc-



cumbed due to lack of treatment in hospitals.

"The Government has no right to deny the right to health in name of only treatment to Covid patients. Kindly, take immediate steps to reopen the hospitals having indoor treatment," urged Samantara.

As per reports, some youths went to the bar near Gadakhordha Chhak in Khordha town at around 5 pm


yesterday to purchase liquor. They parked their car in front of the bar and went in. This was objected by one of the employees Amiya Barik, who asked the youths not to park their car there.

Amiya was rushed to the District Headquarters Hospital, where he was declared brought dead.

HITTING THE BULL'S EYE

Corona will not go soon, but there's good news

Despite being an un-living speck of a pathogen, coronavirus has brought the whole human world to an unprecedented halt. The human race is struggling to survive in an atmosphere of complete void of economic ventures or pursuits. No wealth or money is being generated. The only community active is the media, which unfortunately has chosen to remain focused on the virus

People with heart, kidney and even AIDS problems are pushed aside to make way for corona. It is for sure that many sick people will die due to lack of medical care as hospital beds are kept away for corona management only.

It is strange to see most experts using wrong words and expressions. They don't seem to know plain infection

without symptoms is being corona positive only. Once symptoms show and medical care becomes necessary, it can be called corona virus disease which is Covid. But expressions like 'covid test' and 'covid positive' are grossly wrong to use when infection without symptoms are seen. It is plain corona test; and if infection is confirmed, it is 'corona positive' only. 'Covid' is to be used when the corona positive person requires hospitalisation. That's why 'Covid Hospitals' and 'Covid beds' are so named.

The human race will have to live with flu viruses hereafter as it is not clearly known how many such pathogens nature will produce in future. Only behaviour change can keep humans safe. International travel will of course diminish significantly; and more professionals will be expected to work from home by using technology. Social distancing and mask use will be as ordi-

nary as being 'civil with seniors' and 'wearing undergarments'.

There is quite some good news too. It is clear by now that very effective therapeutic treatments will arrive before perfectly safe vaccines are available. It should also be known well that whenever someone contracts the coronavirus, his or her body's immune system launches a defence, including producing antibodies that circulate in the blood to help identify infectious invaders. The fighting back strength will automatically increase as is natural. In good time, nearly the whole human race will become immune without anything like 'herd infection' happening. Further, rapid, low-cost saliva tests are also being developed to be made available soon. That will be the game changer because they are as simple as home pregnancy tests. One has only to spit into a vial and, in a few minutes, the result will be out. It will cost

between 75 and 350 rupees.

People's behaviour is also becoming more and more civilised and responsible. They have already begun maintaining social distance and wearing masks religiously. People have gained a great deal of common sense in the last four months after seeing what's happening around them.

There is enough evidence by now that past exposure to common-cold coronaviruses might be playing a protective role. This is a big claim, but several studies are now showing that 20% to 50% of people who had never been exposed to coronavirus have immune cells known as 'memory T cells' in their bodies that react to the novel coronavirus.

Vaccine trials seem to be working. Drug manufacturers have already said they might be able to deliver doses by October 2020 as early-stage clinical trials are showing positive signs. So, all is not as bad as being

projected by the social media or similar entities. 'Corona' by all means is a horrible virus, which can cause big damage to the human body. Even after cure, many complain of loss of power to smell and taste besides weak functioning of vital organs.

All the same, life has to go on to avoid death due to starvation particularly in developing countries. The economy has been destroyed, which needs to be revived sooner than initially thought. There is big fear among thinkers that countless non-Covid patients will die as fear of corona infection is irrationally high even among frontline medical experts.

India is a big-population country. Hence, the number of infected is big. But the percentage of affected is still under impressive control. Odisha is considered one of the safest locations today. The State Government had taken timely precautions to keep the region

safe. What has probably been missing is scientifically planned Press briefings by officials to alert masses to remain safe and not panic at all. Unfortunately, quite at the beginning, wrong, self-styled experts from strange domains occupied centrestage and went on spilling meaningless theatrics and farce without making clear basics of safe living. Trained medical experts, domain masters and even highly sensitive bureaucrats are doing superb job now that the wrong elements are out. But these Press events have to be everyday at an appointed hour with real good experts sharing critical information.

There is so much of talk by media about half-baked, unprofessional guys having robbed the State exchequer in the name of making quality information, education and commutation materials. One is said to be a fluke who has grabbed a critical job to come

up only with plain crap. Mainstream filmmakers are not necessarily adept at making social message videos. One needs to do solid homework involving methodical research to know what people will love to see to amend behaviour. Most of the videos made by these guys are too ordinary and carry virtually no sensitive message. One of these filmmakers had also made a messed-up film on Biju Patnaik, which no one got to see. But knowledgeable citizens say it is better the movie has been kept away as it would have diminished Bijubabu's colossal image. This one movie-wonder filmmaker has sunk huge amounts of public money for private gain. He better put back the money to the State. The Naveen Patnaik administration's image may be tarnished if such machinating cash-grabbers keep duping gullible but noble-minded bureaucrats.

2 more die; 286 more Covid +ve in Ganjam

New patients include 34 Covid warriors
130 docs, 5 OAS and 47 ORS officers sent to dist

Two more patients succumbed to the Covid-19 in Ganjam on Wednesday. With this, the total death toll in the district rose to 46. The deceased were identified as a 65-year-old man, who was also suffering from diabetes, and another 86-year-old man, who was also suffering from chronic hypertension.

Along with the increasing deaths, coronavirus cases are virtually exploding in the district with as many as 286 positive cases detected on the day. With the new cases, the total tally in the district rose to 4,621 cases.

The district alone reported 46.2 per cent of the total 618 positive cases registered in the entire State on the day. The 286 new cases included 34 Covid warriors, three persons with travel history to other State and 249 persons with active contact with previous positive cases. All the new cases have been shifted to the Covid Hospital, informed officials.

Currently, the number of active cases in the district stands at 1,874, with 2,701 patients having recovered from the disease.

However, on Tuesday, the State Government deputed as many as 100 doctors, along with 30 medical officers (MBBS doctors) for effective management of the pandemic situation which is worsening day by day in the district.

As per reports, along with the 130 doctors, five OAS officers, 47 ORS (Group-B) Officers and 33 laboratory technicians have also been sent to district to combat the situation.

Besides, the district administration has sealed all the roads leading to the district headquarters town of Chhatrapur and entry of all vehicles except those on essential duties have been banned. People are frisked at the checkpoints and those with Identity Cards are being allowed.

Puri Baliapanda turns safe haven of criminals

Theft, extortion, drugs peddling, armed fight common incidents
Round-the-clock police patrolling demanded

Following an attempt on Thursday night to extort money at gunpoint from a servant's family by a group of five notorious youths in Madanmohan lane of Baliapanda, resentment grew deep in the locality on the law enforcing agencies in Puri.

Amid confrontations, the family members caught one of the accused with other four fleeing in the dark. Before entering to house of the family in their target, they first threatened some residents in other lanes. Police arrested a youth in injured condition who is under treatment in hospital.

It is informed that during confrontations with family the main accused fell down into a water boring system built near the wall and dashed against steel pipes by succumbing to severe injuries on his face.

For such a daredevilry, while the locals have praised the victim family, they have too taken on the law enforcing machineries for a soft corner to notorious elements who are on

a sharp rise now. As per locals, sale of drugs, alcohol and stolen bikes are rampant in Puri. In recent past, three stolen bikes were recovered from near the telephone office area.

Notably a major part of Baliapanda that comes under the Town PS limits is neglected most in respect of law and order. The part situated far from Town PS which is also closer to Baliapanda PS includes Atibadi Niagar, Jagannath Colony, Sagar Padiary, Betrix School, Jami Khuntia and Chakrakota Saraswati Sisu Mandira area. The area is venerable to drug and alcohol peddling, extortion, theft and mid-night transfer of truck-loads of sands from Government lands.

'Atmanirbhar' will empower poor: BJP

The JCC unanimously opposed to the transportation of fertilizers by outside trucks.

CM Naveen must visit Ganjam: Congress

BRAHMAPUR: The Congress on Wednesday demanded that Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik visit Ganjam district and review Covid infection situation soon.

"Coronavirus infection has gone out of control in Ganjam. Though the State Government has not yet agreed to community infection claim, still hundreds of people are getting infected every day. It is disappointing that the Chief Minister, despite being represented from Ganjam for consecutive five terms, has not yet visited the district," lamented Congress district working president Pitabasa Panda.

He urged the CM to visit the district and ensure engagement of adequate doctors and health workers and supply of sufficient medicines for treatment of Covid patients.

4-day shutdown in Phulbani, Balliguda

The entry of people from the neighbouring districts like Ganjam and other Covid-19 hotspots like Bhubaneswar and Cuttack has been totally prohibited.

Noida girl on dharna at Baleswar boyfriend's house

Lodges FIR of being sexually exploited, ditched

A woman travelling all the way from Noida staged a dharna in front of her boyfriend's house at Sasan village of Gadapada panchayat under Rupsa police limits on Tuesday alleging she was sexually exploited by the latter on the pretext of marriage. She also lodged an FIR. SDPO Jalandhar Jali said that she called off her agitation after assurance.

According to reports, the victim, a native of Hooghly district of Bengal came in con-

tact with accused Biswajit Biswal of Sasan village four years ago where they were working in a Noida-based private company. Their closeness turned physical and they were living in a live-in relationship.

According to the complainant, a few days ago, Biswajit faking some emergencies in his home returned to Odisha. Further he ignored her calls. She, further could learn that his marriage was fixed with someone else. Feeling she was ditched by the accused, she rushed from Noida to Rupsa to stop his boyfriend's marriage. She initially appealed to the family members of Biswajit and when they didn't pay any heed, she embarked on dharna and then lodged a complaint with police.

Mayurbhanj locals demand paper mill

Write letter to CM, Union Min

There has been now a strong demand to set up a Government paper mill in the industrially-backward district of Mayurbhanj. Former JMM State general secretary Kalinga Keshari Jena, leading the front, has written a letter to this effect to Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik and Union Minister Pratap Chandra Sarangi.

He has urged both the Union Government and the State Government to come forward to set up a large paper mill in Suliapada Block of the district.

demand. They stressed that, besides yielding other dividends, it will generate employment opportunities for the youths in the district and thus boost the local economy. This will also partially solve the migrant labourers' issue in the region, they opined.

Jena and many others, while interacting with this reporter, have clearly and categorically stated that this largely tribal-dominated district has remained backward for long, and hence, definitely now deserves a fair deal. The issue, therefore, must be taken into serious consideration by both the Central and the State Governments, they demanded.

Baleswar DFO shut down

The Divisional Forest Office (DFO) of Baleswar Wildlife Division has been shut down after a senior official tested positive for Covid-19, a Press release stated on Wednesday.

'Housing for all' in backseat in Odisha'

The implementation of 'Housing for All by 2022' scheme of Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken a backseat in Odisha due to inefficiency of the State Government, alleged BJP State general secretary Prithviraj Harichandan on Wednesday.

Harichandan said the State Government had installed boxes at block offices for receipt of applications for PMAY houses after the BJP protested alleged bribe taking by ruling party workers for distribution of houses. However, the Government has not considered the applications yet. He lamented saying that many such applications were found dumped behind the



Chilika block office on Tuesday. BJP ZP member and some locals saw this, he said.

"From this, it is indicated that applications for PMAY houses have not been enlisted in 314 blocks and ULBs. It is a conspiracy hatched by the State

Government," he alleged. He demanded that the State Government implement the MPAY in proper way and provide houses to the needy soon. Otherwise, it would face a political protest in coming days, warned Harichandan.

Bishnu suffered, struggled for district tag to JSpur

Naked here we come into this world and naked shall we go out of it. The world is a bridge, pass over it but build no house upon it!" expounded a great oriental philosopher. That is what exactly happened in case of Bishnu Das who came, who saw and who conquered the hearts of the tens and thousands of people of Jagatsinghpur and departed without leaving any wealth of fortune for his family. Probably he belonged to the clan of the leaders, whose number is dwindling fast in these days of rank consumerism and godless materialism.

Once when I had the occasion to interview the noted journalist of the country Kuldeep Nayyar. He asked me about late Rabi Ray and Bishnu Das "What about the active young man called one Das of Jagatsinghpur? I remember; I want to meet. Bijubabu had

introduced that young man to me," he reminisced and I had informed Bishnubabu at once.

A devoted follower of legendary leader Biju Patnaik, Bishnu Das' name has been all pervasive among the masses of Jagatsinghpur district and his ubiquitous influence as well as his formidable organisational strength is palpable everywhere in the district. He was initiated into public life at the behest of Biju Patnaik together with encouragement of eminent journalist Kuldeep Nayyar and former lok Sabha Speaker Rabi Ray. He was president of the SVM College Union, Jagatsinghpur from 1977 to 1980 consecutively. He shot into fame during the infamous Chhabirani rape and Murder case by organising a State-wide campaign and courting arrest to bring justice to the wronged.

In 1985, he contested the Assembly elections from the Jagatsinghpur constituency on a Janata Dal ticket and was



humbled by the Congress owing to the sympathy wave out of Indira Gandhi's assassination. But in 1990, he opened his innings to the Assembly as a lone Janata Dal candidate from Jagatsinghpur district. Subsequently, he was re-elected to the Assembly in 1995 and 2000. He was elected for a fourth time in 2004 and for the fifth time in 2009. He became Minister for School and Mass Education in 2006. He was nominated to the Rajya Sabha in 2016. Later on, he was chosen for the coveted position of Vice-Chairman of the State Planning Board, while the post

of the Chairman was adorned by CM Naveen Patnaik himself.

As a leader, he believes in the concept of a man speaking to men and was highly unassuming for which he was endeared to the masses unlike the self-aggrandizing charlatan politicians of today. He had hoped, suffered, struggled, and endured to make Jagatsinghpur a district, which was only possible by his persistent demand before Bijubabu. He was also thinking every now and then to make his alma mater SVM College resplendent by uniting all the alumni and before he could translate this last dreams of his into a reality, he was summoned to join on his pilgrimage to eternity. May the power and providence of the divine give solace and strength to his family and his only son Bijay Shankar to bear this great loss.

Three-day shutdown in Biramitrapur

ROURKELA: In view of the increasing Covid-19 cases in Biramitrapur, the administration on Wednesday decided to impose a three-day shutdown in the municipality area.

The shutdown would be in force from July 17 6 am to July 19 night in all eleven wards under the Biramitrapur Municipality area for active surveillance, contact tracing and disease containment.

There would be restriction on intra-district movement of public and private transport with closure of shops and business establishments, Government and private institutions during the period.

During the shutdown, only the medical establishments including hospitals, clinics, nursing homes, including medicine stores, movement of ambulances and a medical personnel, telecom personnel, petrol pumps, media personnel and water supply and sanitation workers have been exempted from the restrictions.

Grocery shops and milk booths would open from 6 am to 12 pm only. **PNS**

2 contractor men abducted for ₹10L

RAYAGADA: In a major achievement, the Kalyansinghpur police in Rayagada district managed to rescue two kidnapped supervisors of a contractor and nab 11 abductors within an hour of abduction from a road worksite at Mandisahni under Kashipur police limits in the district on Monday afternoon.

A group of 14 men coming on motorcycles had abducted supervisor Jitendra Naik(25) of Khatikaman village and Senapati Naik(40) of Kashipur police station. While taking theme towards Rayagada, they demanded ransom of Rs 10 lakh for their release.

Bhimsen Naik lodged a complaint with the police soon. Kalyansinghpur PS IIC Sukuma Hansdah and her team rose to action and rescued both the victims safely. She also managed to arrest 11 of the accused persons and seize five motorcycles.

Further investigation was underway. **PNS**

'Register migrant workers for database'

Demands INTUC leader Khuntia

Registration of migrant labourers, job creation in the native States, equal right and access to all welfare and healthcare schemes in the host State are required to mitigate migrant workers' woes, said former MP and national vice-president, INTUC, Dr Rama Chandra Khuntia while participating in a webinar.

Because of the faulty policy of national and State Governments, about 689 migrant workers died in accidents and more than 1,000 workers died of Corona while trying to come back to their native State.

Dr Khuntia demanded to amend and strictly implement the Inter-State Migrant Labour Act 1979 and discussion with

host countries to sign bipartite settlement.

The webinar was arranged by the Indo Girman Focal Point Director BK Sahoo and moderated by former Union Secretary Dr Ajay Dua.

Prof Noetil from Germany, Stiabari Nior, ILO migrant labour specialist, Prof Rabi Sribastav of Institute HRD Development Forum, Prof Jogadanda from CYST, Prof Sudaman Baistamb from MGLA Ahmedabad, Sabina, DGB, German National Trade union, among others joined.

Dr Ajay Dua announced five unanimous points as resolution, sent to the Government of India, such as national registration and State registration of migrant workers to create a data base record, compulsory registration of the job in both source and host States, one nation, one ration card and voting right for migrant workers.

COVID-19 OUTBREAK

Forces can buy ₹300 cr weapons without nod

Defence Ministry grants emergency acquisition powers for exigencies

Given the tension at the Line of Actual Control (LAC), the Defence Ministry on Wednesday, in a significant move, granted emergency powers to the armed forces to procure weapons without delay. They can now buy systems up to ₹300 crore on an urgent basis without clearances.

The decision was taken at a special meeting of the Defence Acquisition Council (DAC) chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh. It was convened considering the security environment due to the prevailing situation along the Northern Borders and the need to strengthen the armed forces.

"The DAC delegated the powers for progressing urgent capital acquisition cases up to ₹300 crores to the armed forces to meet their emergent operational requirements. This will shrink the procurement time-



lines and ensure placement of orders within six months and commencement of deliveries within one year," the Ministry said.

Incidentally, similar emergency powers were given after the Balakot air strikes in February 2019. The armed forces have separate financial powers given to Vice Chiefs under the revenue route to procure ammunition and spares.

The latest order comes even as the Army has initiated the process to buy more than 74,000 Sig Sauer assault rifles from the US on fast track basis. These rifles will considerably enhance the firepower capabilities of the infantry soldiers guarding the 4,000 km long LAC facing China and

750-km long Line of Control (LOC) with Pakistan besides combating terrorism and infiltration in Jammu and Kashmir and the north-east.

It has also placed an order for Israeli-made light machine guns (LMG) besides 250 missiles of Spike Anti-Tank Guided Missiles (ATGM) from Israel. In addition, the Army is also looking to procure additional Heron Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV) and man portable air defence systems among others.

The latest DAC decision comes days after Rajnath recently cleared acquisitions worth over ₹39,000 crore including acquisition of 33 frontline fighter jets besides missiles and ammunition.

Covid can take heavy toll on doctors: IMA

All is not well with the health of the doctors taking care of Covid-19 patients, for as many as 99 doctors have succumbed to the disease while 1,302 others have been infected in the country.

Issuing a red alert, the Indian Medical Association (IMA) on Wednesday called for tempering the working hours for doctors' safety and monitoring on daily basis the provision of PPEs, physical distancing and sanitisers.

Operation theaters, labour rooms, laboratories and casualties require special care. ICUs and Critical Care units deserve close scrutiny for adherence to best practices and protocols, the IMA said which represent the medical professionals in the country.

The IMA pointed out that database of the National Covid Registry shows that in all 99 doctors died. Of them, 73 doctors were above 50 years of age, accounting for 75 per cent of the total deaths among doctors.

While 19 doctors were in the age group of 35-50 years, accounting for 19 per cent of the deaths and seven doctors were in the age group of below 35 years, accounting for 6 per cent of the doctor deaths.

In all, 1,401 doctors were exposed to the virus. Among the 1,302 doctors infected, 586 are practicing doctors, 566 resident doctors, and 150 house



surgeons.

"Covid-19 death amongst doctors is of great concern. Medical profession remains the beacon of hope for the nation to lead the exit from the pandemic. IMA strongly advocates the leadership of doctors in adopting all scientific best practices. Wide dissemination of such knowledge is happening through an avalanche of webinars helping doctors to face the challenge," said IMA president Dr Rajan Sharma and honorary secretary general Dr RV Asokan in a joint release on Wednesday.

"If Covid-19 mortality has to be lessened, it has to start with doctors and hospitals. This requires intense review and updating of all administrative set ups in the hospitals including the infection control protocols," the IMA heads said suggesting that gaps in providing for the safety of doctors, nurses and staff be closed.

They stressed on the need for a feedback system from the doctors, employees and public needs to be in place besides adhering to cleaning and sanitisation protocols.

"Administrative gaps are being addressed. Clinics and nursing homes have opened.

Coronavirus may attack patients' nervous system, cause anxiety, depression: Study

Depressed mood or anxiety exhibited in Covid-19 patients may possibly be an indication that the virus has affected the central nervous system (CNS), according to a study published in the journal The Laryngoscope.

The study said that these two psychological symptoms were most closely associated with a loss of smell and taste rather than the more severe indicators of the novel coronavirus such as shortness of breath, cough or fever.

"The unexpected results that the potentially least worrisome symptoms of Covid-19 may be causing the greatest degree of psychological distress could potentially tell us something about the disease," said study researcher Ahmad Sedaghat from the University of Cincinnati in the US.

For the study, the research team conducted a prospective, cross-sectional telephone questionnaire study which exam-

ined characteristics and symptoms of 114 patients who were diagnosed with Covid-19 over a six-week period at Kantonsspital Aarau in Aarau, Switzerland.

The severity of the loss of smell or taste, nasal obstruction, excessive mucus production, fever, cough and shortness of breath during COVID-19 were assessed.

At the time of enrollment in the study, when participants were experiencing Covid-19, 47.4 per cent of participants reported at least several days of depressed mood per week while 21.1 per cent reported depressed mood nearly every day.

In terms of severity, 44.7 per cent of participants reported expressing mild anxiety while 10.5 per cent reported severe anxiety.

"We think our findings suggest the possibility that psychological distress in the form of depressed mood or anxiety may reflect the penetration of SARS-CoV-2, the

virus that causes COVID-19, into the central nervous system."

Sedaghat said researchers have long thought that the olfactory tract may be the primary way that coronaviruses enter the central nervous system.

Studies using mouse models of that virus have shown that the olfactory tract, or the pathway for communication of odours from the nose to the brain, was a gateway into the central nervous system and infection of the brain.

"These symptoms of psychological distress, such as depressed mood and anxiety are central nervous system symptoms if they are associated only with how diminished is your sense of smell," Sedaghat said.

"This may indicate that the virus is infecting olfactory neurons, decreasing the sense of smell, and then using the olfactory tract to enter the central nervous system," he noted.

Hospitals are functioning to capacity. Protocols and procedures are in place. Doctors need to take charge of the sit-

uation and ensure the safety of themselves, their families, their colleagues and staff," they said calling upon the senior doctors

who are decision makers for the institutions to take more responsibility to take care of their flock.

Modi urges youth to upskill to tap enhanced opportunities

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday urged the youth to learn more skills to enhance opportunities in the changed world order due to the pandemic crisis. And he laid out the mantra for them: Skill, re-skill and upskill.

He was addressing a web conference on the occasion of the fifth year of the Skill Mevopment Mission. Referring to the portal launched recently for mapping the skilled employees and employers, Modi said this would help the skilled workers, including the migrant workers who have returned to their homes, to access jobs easily and the employers to contact skilled employees.

"The biggest strength of the millennials is their ability to get skilled. The ongoing coronavirus pandemic has changed the work culture and started the concept of work from home; for this the youth are acquiring new

skills keeping in mind the new work culture and mind nature of job" said Modi.

"People ask me business and markets are changing too fast, it's hard to remain relevant. In times of corona, this is even more relevant. My answer to that is to skill, re-skill and upskill. To keep learning new skills is to re-skill and continuing to scale it up is to upskill," he added.

The Prime Minister stated that the Skill India Mission launched five years back has led to creation of a vast infrastructure for skilling, reskilling and upskilling and enhancing opportunities to access employment both locally and globally. It has led to hundreds of PM Kaushal Kendras being set up across the country and an increase in the capacity of the ITI ecosystem. Due to these concerted efforts, more than five crore youth have been skilled in the last five years, said Modi.

He described skills as a gift

which we can give to ourselves and added that skills are timeless, unique, a treasure trove and a means by which one can not only become employable but also help in leading a satisfying life. He said that a natural attraction to acquire new skills provides new energy and encouragement in one's life.

Skills are not only a means to a livelihood but also a reason to feel lively and energetic in our daily routine. The Prime Minister also brought out the distinction between 'knowledge' and 'skills' in his address. He illustrated this with an example - that knowing how a cycle runs is 'knowledge' while actually being able to ride a cycle was a 'skill'. It is important for the youth to realise the difference between the two and their different contexts and implications.

With an example from carpentry, he explained the nuances between skilling, reskilling and upskilling.

Universal testing may reduce virus spread: Study

As the incidence of novel Coronavirus infection goes up globally, universal testing besides implementing precautions like handwashing and wearing mask, according to a study by John Hopkin's University, may also help in slowing down the spread of SARS-CoV-2, the virus responsible for causing the deadly disease.

"More testing resources are urgently needed to identify the true burden of Covid-19 in long-term care facilities so that we can be more successful in curbing infection and mortality in one of the disease's major hot spots," said study senior author Morgan Katz from the JHU.

Researchers performed universal testing among all 893 men and women, at 11 long-term care centres in Maryland, USA. Initially, only people who showed symptoms were being

tested by the local health departments. It is found that among 893 people, 354 people tested Covid-19 positive, while only 153 were found positive when tested based on their symptoms. Almost 40 per cent of the total people tested positive during universal testing.

Universal screening, therefore, led to arise in Covid-19 cases among residents in the United state's long-term care facilities by 231 per cent. Of those who tested positive, about 281 people were asymptomatic.

"These results underscore the importance of universal testing, as symptom-based approaches may miss a substantial number of cases in long-term care facilities," said study lead author Benjamin Bigelow.

"Unrecognised asymptomatic cases among residents can severely hinder preventive strategies and increase the risk of the virus dangerously spreading," Bigelow added.

Recovery rate climbs to 63.24 per cent

The Government on Wednesday said that with the number of Covid-19 patients recovering to 5,92,031, the recovery rate has climbed up to 63.24 per cent.

The actual case load of Covid-19 is only 3,19,840 active cases. "They are all under medical supervision. The norms and standards for Home Isolation along with use of oxymeters have helped to keep a check on the asymptomatic or mildly symptomatic patients without putting pressure on the hospital infrastructure," said a statement from the Union Health Ministry here .

The surge in recovered cases is driven by aggressive testing, timely diagnosis

The surge in recovered cases is driven by aggressive testing, timely diagnosis and effective management of the patients either through supervised home isolation or under active medical attention in the hospitals.

The gap between recovered and active cases has been consistently growing. It stands at 2,72,191 today.

The number of recovered cases outweighs the active cases by a factor of 1.85.

Medical infrastructure in India to treat COVID-19 patients includes 1,378 Dedicated Covid Hospitals (DCH), 3,077 Dedicated Covid Health Centres (DCHC), and 10,351 Covid Care Centres (CCC). They have a total of 21,738 ventilators, 46,487 ICU beds, and 1,65,361 Oxygen beds to treat Covid-19 patients.

The Central Government has distributed 230.98 lakhs N95 masks, 123.56 lakhs PPEs and 11,660 ventilators to States/UTs/Central institutions to ensure effective clinical management of Covid-19.

EC Ashok Lavasa gets new assignment at ADB

Election Commissioner Ashok Lavasa has been appointed as vice president for Private Sector Operations and Public-Private Partnerships at the Asian Development Bank. The ADB statement said he will succeed Diwakar Gupta, whose term will end on August 31. ADB appoints a vice-president for a term of three years, which can be extended by another two years.

Lavasa would be only the second election commissioner to step down from the poll panel before completion of his term after chief election commissioner Nagendra Singh, who was appointed a judge in the International Court of Justice at The Hague in 1973. Lavasa, a retired 1980 batch IAS officer of Haryana cadre, was

appointed as an Election Commissioner in January 2018.

Sources said the government had recommended a few nominees to the ADB, including Lavasa's name. Since election commissioners serve for a term of six years or till they reach the age of 65, Lavasa, who was appointed to the post in January 2018 and was born in October 1957 still has over two years of his term left at the Election Commission and was on track to become the chief election commissioner next April, when the current CEC, Sunil Arora retires. As per the provisions of the Election Commission (Conditions of Service of Election Commissioners and Transaction of Business) Act, 1991, an EC or the CEC can tender his or her resignation addressed to the President.

Lavasa had made headlines

during the 2019 Lok Sabha elections when he gave a dissenting note to the Election Commission of India (ECI) giving a clean chit to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and former BJP president Amit Shah on charges of violating the Model Code of Conduct. Soon after the elections, three members of the Lavasa family including his wife came under the scanner of the Income Tax Department for alleged non-declaration of income and disproportionate assets.

In September 2019, a notice was sent to Lavasa's wife Novel S Lavasa for alleged discrepancies in income tax filings. In November, the Enforcement Directorate started an investigation against a company in which Lavasa's son Abir was a director, for alleged violation of foreign exchange laws. The Lavasa family members have, however,

denied the allegations.

The ADB on Wednesday, said that Lavasa has a long and distinguished career in the Indian civil service.

"Lavasa led the Indian delegation in the climate change negotiations for the Paris Agreement and was instrumental in finalizing India's nationally determined contributions, which included a major role of the private sector. At both policy and project levels, he made significant contributions to the inclusion of the private sector in many development programs in India for different sectors such as energy, agriculture, finance, and infrastructure. As Joint Secretary in the Department of Economic Affairs, he worked closely with many ADB projects that had private sector components," the ADB said.

Check black marketing of Covid medicines: Parl Panel

A parliamentary panel on Wednesday suggested top government officials to check black marketing of coronavirus medicines, consider capping their prices and promote locally made and easily available cheaper medicines, sources said.

Home Secretary Ajay Bhalla, Joint Secretary in Health Ministry Lav Agarwal and other officials briefed the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Home Affairs chaired by Congress leader Anand Sharma on the management of the Covid-19 pandemic and phased unlocking and resumption of economic activities.

During the meeting, the committee members expressed concern about black marketing of drugs such as Remdesivir

and Tocilizumab, the sources said, adding that they also suggested capping the price of these drugs.

Cutting across party lines, the MPs advocated for promoting locally made and easily available medicines, saying the pharmaceutical lobby was trying to suppress the cheaper drugs by pushing for expensive options, the sources said. The members were also briefed by officials on lockdown and its effectiveness in checking the spread of the virus in the country. Sources said Home Secretary Bhalla made a presentation on the overall handling of the situation by the government.

The MPs suggested a national database of migrant labour be created as it will help in improving their social security and they should be given direct cash benefit and rations.



Suggestions were also given for schools to prescribe a fixed time for online classes and ensure counselling of students in these tough times, the sources said.

Appreciating the handling of COVID-19 crisis in the

national capital by the Centre, some members were of the opinion that similar efforts are required in other big metro cities such as Mumbai and Chennai. There was also a suggestion for a new law to deal with infectious disease.

61 dead, over 45L people affected in Assam floods

As many as 45.40 lakh people and 33.96 lakh animals (big and small) including poultry in 26 of the 33 districts in Assam are affected by the devastating floods. The flood situation continues to deteriorate with the number of deaths going up to 61. Over 95 per cent of the Kaziranga National Park, a world heritage site, has been inundated and 66 wild animals including two rhinos have died and 170 animals were rescued. This is the third rhino death in the park - the largest habitat of one-horned rhinos in the world - this monsoon. Most of the rivers in the state are in spate. According to the India Meteorological

Department, Assam has received 22 percent excess rainfall so far. The state has received 796 mm rainfall as against the normal of 652 mm so far.

Many roads, bridges, culverts and other infrastructure have been damaged in floods and landslides across the state. The worst hit districts in the state are Hojai, Dhemaji, Lakhimpur, Biswanath, Sonitpur, Udalguri, Darrang, Baksa, Nalbari, Barpeta, Chirang, Bongaigaon, Kokrajhar, Dhubri, Goalpara, Kamrup, Nagaon, Golaghat, Jorhat, Majuli, Sivasagar, Dibrugarh, Tinsukia and Karbi Anglong.



lages are under flood waters and standing crops in 1.28 lakh hectares have been ruined.

More than 44,000 have been moved to state relief camps. As per daily situation report of ASDMA, over 45.40 lakh people, 33.96 lakh animals in 26 of the 33 districts in Assam are

affected by the devastating floods. The death tolls has reached to 61. The State Government has set up 426 relief camps in which more than 1.18 lakh people have taken shelter so far.

In a widely-shared video tweeted by BJP MLA Mrinal Saikia from Khumtai, is seen wading through waist-deep water to help rescue people and livestock marooned because of floods.

P Sivakumar, Director, Kaziranga National Park said that as many as, 66 animals have died with 23 deaths (two rhinos, five wild boars, a swamp deer, 14 hog deer, and a porcupine) due to drowning and 12 (all hog deer) after they were hit by speeding vehicles

and 170 animals were rescued. A total of 45 animals (all hog deer) have been injured - 44 due to floods and one due to a vehicle hit. Over 80 per cent Kaziranga Park has been inundated and 153 of the total 223 forest camps inside are inundated, of which 14 of which have been vacated. Water from the swollen Brahmaputra river and its tributaries has entered the Kaziranga Park, which has forced tigers and other animals to flee to human habitats and highlands for survival.

There were reports of more tigers being sighted when they were trying to escape floodwaters. One of the tigers was spotted in Karbi Anglong district and while another was seen near the National

Highway 37.

Each year, the monsoon floods inundate the National Park, located on the edge of the Eastern Himalayan biodiversity hotspots of Golaghat and Nagaon district, forcing a large number of the wild animals to leave the park and head towards the nearby hills in Karbi Anglong district by crossing National Highway-37 that passes near the park's boundary.

According to a paper published by the Assam government in 2015, soil erosion has claimed over 3,800 sq km of farmland since 1954 - around half the size of Sikkim. Approximately 8,000 hectares of land was being eroded every year.

623 more test +ve in Kerala

For the second day in succession, more than 600 persons in Kerala were diagnosed with Covid-19. "On Wednesday 623 persons were tested positive for Covid-19. Out of this, 432 persons infected the coronavirus through social contacts. Expatriates accounted for 96 cases while 76 were those from other parts of the country," said Pinarayi Vijayan, chief minister of Kerala in his daily press briefing. Vijayan disclosed that 602 persons afflicted with Covid-19 were hospitalised on Wednesday. "As on Wednesday, there are 4,880 persons undergoing treatment in various hospitals. The State has till now diagnosed 9, 513 persons with

Covid," said the Chief Minister.

As the situation has turned grave and dangerous in Kerala, the Government has changed the catchword against coronavirus from the present "Break The Chain" to "Caution as Precious as Life", according to Vijayan.

The CM said 1.86 lakh persons were under observation in the State while 2.6 lakh samples have been tested. "The Government is actively considering the possibility of increasing the number of testing facilities and setting up First Line Covid Treatment Centres across the State," said Vijayan.

Thiruvananthapuram topped the list of districts with the highest number of patients-157. Situation in other parts of the State were not different.

Kerala Catholic priest wants to marry his rape victim

Kochi: Kerala Catholic priest Robin Vadakkumchery, 52, sentenced to 20 years in jail in three different cases of rape and abuse of a minor, has moved the Kerala High Court seeking to marry the victim and take care of the child born to her.

Gold smuggling scam turns murky as Minister Jaleel's claims proved wrong

It lookS the noose is tightening around the Kerala Government led by Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan as the gold smuggling scam busted by Customs officials is assuming alarming size and spilling out new details.

While M Sivsankar, the former principal secretary to the Chief Minister who was summoned by the Customs officials on Tuesday evening was questioned for a marathon nine hours and left off by Wednesday morning informing him that he may have to present himself at the Kochi office of the Department if need arises, the day also saw Customs officials raiding the offices of Kerala State IT Infrastructure Ltd at the capital city where Swapna Suresh was employed as liaison officer by the IT Department headed by Sivsankar.

At the same time, the façade of denials by Higher Education Minister K T Jaleel about his telephonic conversation with Swapna Suresh, one of the kingpins of the gold smuggling racket was demolished by a section of

the media on Wednesday.

Though the minister, a former leader of the banned SIMI had claimed on Tuesday that he spoke to Swapna on May 27 at the instance of the UAE Consul General, details of call records aired by Janam News prove that he was having telephonic contacts with the controversial woman as early as April.

Though the Customs Department is yet to make any official statement about the arrests, seizure and questioning of the suspects, information trickling out of the Thiruvananthapuram office of the department confirm that Sivsankar had told the officials that he had close relationship with Swapna Suresh and he might have intervened once or twice to help her personally.

He was allowed to go home on the condition that he should make available himself for further grilling as and when needed. The Customs officials also got enough information that substantiates the close proximity Sivsankar had with Swapna, Sarith and Sandeep.

TN shows slight fall in number of active patients

The Covid-19 situation in Tamil Nadu is a mixture of hope and despair as on Wednesday. While a total of 4,496 persons were diagnosed with Covid-19 on Wednesday (less than Tuesday's 4,526), the number of active cases in the State too came down on Wednesday. The medical bulletin issued by Tamil Nadu Government said there were 47, 340 active covid patients in the State on Wednesday. This is less than Tuesday's numbers-47,912.

The day also saw 5,000 persons coming out of hospitals, fully cured of the pandemic. This took the total number of persons in the State who were cured of the disease to 1.02 lakh.

The death toll continued to be in the higher side as 68 persons succumbed to the coronavirus on Wednesday. Out of this, 64 persons had pre-existing morbidity (chronic diseases). The total number of persons tested positive for covid-19 till date in the State reached 1.51 lakh by Wednesday.

Coming to the negative news, Chennai reported an increase in the number of persons tested positive on Wednesday.

MLA's 'murder': Mamata writes to Prez against BJP narrative

A day after a BJP delegation met President Ram Nath Kovind seeking his attention to what they called a TMC-sponsored "cold blooded murder" of Debendranath Roy, a saffron MLA from Hemtabad in North Bengal, CM Mamata Banerjee wrote a letter to the first citizen blaming the BJP for "distorting" a "suspected suicide" for "political gains".

The letter handed over to the President by senior TMC MP Derek O' Brien also dropped hints of a possible bank scam with the unnatural death of the BJP Legislator.

Banerjee wrote, "...This is in the context of your meeting with a delegation of BJP who might have appraised you with some distorted fact." The letter further said that the dead MLA's body was "found on a hanging condition from a tin shed/verandah in front of a mobile shop which he used to visit to meet the local people. On receipt of post mortem and on primary investigation, West Bengal Police has reported that it is a case of suspected suicide and could be related to some local money transfer activities."

The note found in the pocket of the deceased leader referred to two names --- out of whom one had been arrested --- who were "allegedly found to be related to such money transfer activities in the locality," Banerjee wrote adding "I am sorry to say that it does not appear to be a political case being projected by BJP".

Roy died an unnatural death reportedly in the wee hours of Monday by hanging from a bar outside a shop about a mile away from his house. The BJP instantly picked up the issue calling it a cold-blooded murder and called a North Bengal bandh on Tuesday.

O'Brien who met the President for 25 minutes on Wednesday later said our Chief Minister has explained the entire in details to the President telling how the BJP is trying to politicize the issue."

Palghar 'sadhus' lynching: No bail for 25 accused

A Dahanu court on Wednesday rejected the bail applications of 25 accused in the much-discussed Palghar lynching incident in which two Sadhus and one driver were killed by a mob of villagers on April 16.

Accepting the contention of the Prosecution in the case that there were "multiple evidences" in the case against the accused, Additional Sessions Judge at the Dahanu Sessions Court in Palghar district D. H. Keluskar rejected the bail applications of the 25 accused on technical grounds.

Earlier, opposing the bail plea, Special Public Prosecutor Satish Maneshinde had told the court that the Prosecution had gathered "multiple evidences" against the accused. The evidence, he said, included: mobile Call Data Records and other technical evidence.

Among other things, the SPP had told the court that the examination of mobile phones of the accused revealed that they were present at the crime spot when the incident took place.

It may be recalled that on the night of April 16, three persons were lynched by a 200-strong mob of villagers near Kasa town in Maharashtra's Palghar district on suspicion that they were thieves.

The villagers first hurled stones at the van, prompting the driver to stop the vehicle. Later, they pulled three persons out of the vehicle and beat them to death in Gadchinchale village on Dabhadi-Khanwel road, with sticks and rods.

The deceased -- identified as Chikne Maharaj Kalpavrukshagiri (70), Sushilgiri Maharaj (35) and dripte Nileshtelgade (30) were travelling to Surat. Of them one was the driver, while two are residents of Kandivli in north Mumbai. The place

where the incident took place is approximately 120 km from Mumbai.

After the incident, the Kasa police had registered three FIRs in connection with the lynching and assault on policemen. All the accused had been arrested a day after the ghastly crime.

In the first FIR, the police had charged 110 accused with murder under IPC Section 302. In the second FIR, the 110 accused were booked under IPC Section 307 (attempt to murder) and 353 (detering government servant from performing his duty) for assaulting cops and damaging their vehicle.

Subsequently, the Crime Investigation Department (CID) sleuths of the Maharashtra police, who took over the investigations into the case, arrested 25 more persons taking the total number of the accused in the case to 135.

Maha CM seeks realignment of Akola-Khandwa Rail route

Proposed route will impact tiger habitat: State Govt

Concerned by the fact the proposed Railway gauge conversion of the Akola-Khandwa line would have an "irreversible impact" on the endangered species and their habitat, the Maharashtra Government has urged the Railway Ministry to withdraw the proposal and consider alternate alignment outside the Melghat Tiger.

In a letter shot off to Railway Minister Piyush Goyal, Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray expressed serious reservations about the proposal involving the gauge conversion of the Akola-Khandwa line proposed by the South-Central Railway which passes through the

"core critical Tiger Habitat of Melghat Tiger Reserve" in Maharashtra.

The proposal involves construction of tunnels by cutting and blasting rocks using heavy machinery and explosives. It also involves realignment away from the existing track to ease sharp curves on 23.48 km out of a total length of 38 km "passing through the core area of the Tiger Reserve". "This amounts to realignment and not just the gauge conversion along the existing railway track," he said.

"Considering that the long-term irreversible impacts of the gauge conversion on endangered species like the Tiger and their habitat, it would be appropriate to focus

on alternative alignments which would not only ensure much required space for the wild life but also bring railway connectivity and greater economic development to hitherto unconnected villages located in Jalgaon-Jamed and Sangrampur talukas and benefiting almost 100 villages in the vicinity of the alternative alignment," the chief minister wrote in his letter.

The chief minister went on to urge the minister to "withdraw" the proposal and consider alternative alignment of the railway line outside the Melghat Tiger Reserve "in the interest of wildlife conservation in general and protection of the tiger habitat in particular". In this context Uddhav said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had himself said that the "the conservation of tigers is not a choice but an imperative".

Will act against those cheating Covid-19 patients with fake plasma samples: Maha Govt

Taking serious cognisance of complaints about some miscreants cheating the needy Covid-19 patients after plasma, Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh said on Wednesday that the State Government would initiate stern action against those fleecing the people by making false claims of having tested positive for Covid-19 and promising donation of plasma samples for treatment.

Talking to media persons here, Deshmukh said: "Many infected people are getting cured by the plasma donated by the cured patients. ...It being the case that only the cured patients can donate plasma, some people are taking advantage of the situation to make false claims through affidavits that they

had tested positive Covid-19 to make plasma donations".

"Though no one has come forward to complain formally about lakhs of rupees collected from them by making false claims of having tested positive for Coronavirus and promising plasma samples, I have heard such things are happening. If the affected people come forward and lodge complaints with the police, we will take serious cognisance of the complaints and act sternly against the miscreants. We will allow miscreants cheating the Covid-19 patients who genuinely need plasma samples from the cured patients," the Minister said.

"I request the affected Covid-19 patients to either lodge a complaint at the police station or make a complaint on www.cybercrime.gov.in," Deshmukh said.

7,975 afflicted, 233 die in Maharashtra

The total number of Covid-19 infections crossed 7,000 mark in Maharashtra on Wednesday, as the State recorded 7,975 new positive cases while 233 more people succumbed to the pandemic.

With 7,975 fresh infections and 233 fatalities, the total number of positive cases in the cases jumped to 2,75,640, while the total number of deaths inched closer to 11,000 as the figure touched 10,928.

Of the total deaths reported to Wednesday, Mumbai alone accounted for 62 deaths, which took the total number of deaths in the metropolis from 5,405 to 5,467, while the total number of Covid-19 cases rose by 1,374 to touch 96,474.

In addition to 62 deaths recorded in Mumbai, there were 49 deaths in Thane, 48 deaths in Pune, 14 in Jalgaon, 13 in Nashik, 10 in Solapur, 6 in Palghar, 5 each in Raigad, Kolhapur and Aurangabad, 4 in

Latur, 3 each in Dhule and Jalna, 2 in Sangli, 1 each in Satara, Ratnagiri, Nanded and Amravati.

With 67360 infected cases and 1818 deaths, Thane continued to be the second worst hit district in Maharashtra. Pune, which has emerged as the third worst affected district in terms of spread of the pandemic, has recorded 44202 infections and 1,200 deaths till now.

In a related development, the total number of patients discharged from various hospitals after full recovery since the second week of March this year touched 1,52,613. The recovery rate in the state stood at 55.37 per cent. The mortality rate in the state is 3.96 per cent. The state health authorities pegged the number of "active cases" in the state at 1,11,801.

Out of 14,08,901 samples sent to laboratories, 2,75,640 have tested positive (19.56 per cent) for Covid-19 until Wednesday.

Abducted BJP leader safely rescued by J&K Police

Jammu : Mehraj Din Malla, an abducted Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader and Vice-President of Watergarm Municipal Committee, Baramulla was safely rescued by the Jammu and Kashmir Police late Wednesday evening.

He was abducted by 'unidentified' terrorists from Rafiabad area of Baramulla. Inspector General of Police, Kashmir ranger Vijay Kumar late evening confirmed, "Mehraj Din Malla, BJP leader & vice-president of Watergarm Municipal Committee in Baramulla who was abducted earlier today has been rescued by Police".

After the killing of a young BJP leader Sheikh Wasim Bari, former district President Bhandipora, the abduction of another BJP leader had kept senior police officers on their tenterhooks throughout the day.

Several teams of Jammu and Kashmir police were working on ground zero since morning to track down the footprints

of his abductors. Mehraj Din Malla's family members including his daughter had made passionate appeals to those unidentified abductors to release their loved one.

Unconfirmed reports indicated, after identifying the abductors, local police teams had called family members of a Lashkar-e- Tayyeba commander to one of the police stations to ensure safe release of a BJP leader. It is learnt, a local LeT commander identified as Sajjad had issued threats to BJP leaders and family members of policemen of dire consequences. PNS

Digital reliance

Raising funds in the midst of a pandemic is no joke. Mukesh Ambani should be applauded but is his nervousness justified?



On the day Reliance Industries held its first virtual annual general meeting, India's largest and most valuable private enterprise announced that search giant Google has invested \$4.5 billion into Reliance's Jio platforms, the conglomerate's digital arm. This raises the amount that India's richest man, Mukesh Ambani, has raised for Reliance Jio to close to \$20 billion, an impressive feat in the best of times. But given that the world is suffering a healthcare meltdown, thanks to the Coronavirus pandemic, this is an extraordinary feat. In all, Google plans to pump \$10 billion over the next five to seven years in the Indian market to help accelerate the adoption of digital technologies. A flurry of deals made in recent times has given the much-needed financial backing to Ambani's ambition to morph Reliance from an energy company to an e-commerce giant. Almost all the funds have been raised by American technology firms and financial institutions. Both Google and Facebook are part of the firm, much like its parent Reliance Industries. Jio is trying to become completely vertically integrated. It is doing it all — from creating 5G infrastructure at home to manufacturing smartphones for users, the creation of software services like Jio Meet as well as expanding Reliance's huge media play by owning a host of entertainment and news channels. The biggest single positive here is that Mukesh Ambani, like his father Dhirubhai Ambani before him, is a believer in India and the capabilities of this nation. He plans to build capacity within the country rather than import it. This was something made vitally important to every single Indian after the fire-breathing Chinese Dragon singed us last month. We can argue *ad nauseam* about how China might have lost the Indian market for a couple of generations but nothing speaks like action. While he might not look like it, Mukesh Ambani is a man of action. And for all this, he must be applauded.

However, and there's always a however, the way Reliance has garnered its funds and the fact that it is on the verge of becoming a monopolistic venture in telecommunications and technology services with only a couple of rivals — one of which is almost bankrupt — it does raise some concern. It remains to be seen how Ambani will deploy the funds raised in the Indian market. Will he buy out rivals in the e-commerce and groceries space? Or will every Indian have to move from one Reliance store to the next, albeit in the guise of other brands, thanks to Reliance retail owning the rights of several multinational brands in India? Or is there another way of looking at it? Should India nurture and raise national champions like Reliance Industries? The old guard of Indian companies could not scale enough or be scaled in different areas. As for Reliance, the pivot towards Jio and telecom has been a long time coming. The family feud meant that Mukesh Ambani had to wait for a decade and for his brother to mess up to get back into this space. He is not wasting any time now and his ambitions have scaled up from the time he launched Reliance Infocomm. With a clear roadmap for the future, his execution capabilities and striking a string of deals, Mukesh Ambani has proved just how an extremely competitive industry like telecom can yield striking returns. He is also securing the future for the Ambani clan for another half a century and possibly doing more to secure India's digital future away from the Chinese than any other individual.

Trouble in Chabahar

Iran drops India from Chabahar port rail project as China seals a new economic and security deal worth \$400 billion



India's traditional relationship with Iran is finally being stretched by our strategic closeness to the US and is pushing that nation directly into the arms of China. And this might cost us a project that we had heavily invested in, the Chabahar port. For now, the Iranian Government has decided to drop India as a partner for the construction of a rail line from Chabahar port to Zahedan, along the border with Afghanistan, and go on its own. It will use its own engineers and not consult Indian expertise either. This, it claims, is because of India's

tardy initiative and not moving any funds although an agreement was signed four years ago. India has been stalling under the shadow of US sanctions, which seek to penalise countries doing business with Iran. According to reports, Iran, which wants to complete the line by March 2022, will use \$400 million from the Iranian National Development Fund. And despite a pandemic-hit economy, it is going in for massive spends simply because China has signed a 25-year economic and security partnership with it worth \$400 billion. This entails Chinese entry in banking, telecommunications, ports, railways and other infrastructure projects. It fulfils China's neo-imperialist desires, colonising another economy in the process, and keeps its domestic industries running with cheaper Iranian oil for the next 25 years. India, by comparison, has stopped importing Iranian crude oil under US pressure. The agreement also proposes military cooperation, which could make China a key player in regional geopolitics and counter the US.

India has been completely caught off guard by this deal even as it tried various rounds of negotiations with the US to spare it from sanctions for conducting certain businesses with Iran. Though India got exemption for the Chabahar port and the rail link, equipment suppliers feared a hitback and slowed down progress. Besides, Iran was upset by India's decision to completely stop energy imports, quite a big basket of its earnings. Now China has assured it of its oil market, picking up supplies for 25 long years, taking away Iran's worries. Bilateral ties with Iran nosedived further with the naked display of majoritarian politics during the Delhi riots in February with its Foreign Minister Javad Zarif strongly condemning them. Now there is talk of a greater Chinese stake, the deal merely an access card to Chabahar's duty free zone, an oil refinery and the port itself. In fact, though Iran has denied it, there is speculation that it could lease out the entire port to its new benefactor. That would be a big blow to India, which had hoped to build an alternate trade route from Chabahar to Afghanistan and Central Asia, bypassing Pakistan. But now with the Chinese reclaiming the vacuum, it will strengthen the China-Pakistan axis around the coast. The China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) and the Gwadar port will strengthen that conduit. Iran says it has not abandoned India, but clearly it has decided to go with the biggest Asian power and the US' arch enemy on a need-based formula. We may think that we forced China's hand by retaliating in Galwan but all it did was ensure strategic calm when world opinion would have isolated it further had it escalated its aggression. As the only country whose growth projections are not negative post-pandemic, it can afford to buy out vulnerable nations. It has already invested in banks in Brazil. India may be its economic bulwark but China is quickly encircling it by winning over our old allies and neighbours. It is no less beligerent, just that it has now launched an economic warfare with India.

Save the common spirit

The Gurkhas cannot and should not be sacrificed at the altar of partisan politics or the smallness of spirit that besets present times because of Indo-Nepalese differences

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had invoked a "special relationship", based on shared culture, language and religion, with Nepal during his first official visit to Kathmandu in 2014. He had said, "This is the land of Sita and Janak, Nepal-India relations are as old as the Himalayas and the Ganga." Given his proclivity for abbreviations, Modi had coined HIT (Highways, I-Ways and Transways) as the transformational formula to strengthen age-old ties between the two nations. Much water has flown down the rivers Kosi, Gandaki and Karnali (the three big rivers that flow from Nepal to India) and Nepal has instead vested its trust in the Chinese Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) to usher in the much-needed transformation.

Nepalese Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli's speech in New Delhi in 2018 was less flowery and presciently loaded. Repeatedly, he stressed on a "balanced outlook" in external relations, an unmistakable euphemism to "correct" the pro-India tilt. Nepal had just emerged from the perceived wounds of India's braggadocio during the 2015 earthquake relief operations and the supposed interferences in the framing of a new Constitution. Agitation over this issue had led to a crippling "blockade." In an age of social media, the hurt felt by a proud nation, which has never been ruled by outsiders, was palpable. Murmurs of India's "big brotherly" attitude being unacceptable gained credence in the streets of Nepal.

Oli had alluded to that overarching trust deficit and sinking sentiment. "Good neighbourliness demands harmonious co-existence forever. And trust is the key cementing factor. It derives its strength from the observance of such fundamental principles as equality, justice, mutual respect and benefit as well as non-interference," said Oli. He added that for impact, "it is natural to expect similar assurance from India." Clearly, the healing process never kicked off and today, ties between India and Nepal have reached an unprecedented low due to border violence, cartographical disputes and trust eroding measures like Nepal's decision to ban the Indian media.

Undoubtedly, there are layered complexities of missteps that were taken by both sides in equal measure. Both nations were driven by their own domestic political considerations, short-termism and geo-political churns that widened the faultlines, which always existed but never flared up to this extent. The crests and troughs of bilateral relations were always handled politically, without any unnecessary attribution to the societal-ethnicity of the people involved. Today, that venerated "Gurkha" stands to be dangerously demonised as collateral damage. The delinking of "politics" and "people" has not been the strength of the current dispensation. Deliberate contextualisation and binarisation of circumstances



may still yield electoral gratification but this will come at the cost of alienating almost all neighbouring countries, well beyond Pakistan and China.

The intermingling and intermeshing of the Indo-Nepalese people are not just historical, cultural, spiritual, religious or even transactional; it is unparalleled in terms of the faith, trust and reverence that is afforded on the "Gurkha" in the Indian consciousness. Nearly 40 dedicated Gurkha Regiment battalions with approximately 40,000 Indian and Nepali Gurkha soldiers defend India's sovereignty. Another one lakh veterans reside in Nepal and the annals of Indian Army's valour testify to the raw gallantry of the likes of Lt Col Dhan Singh Thapa, Param Vir Chakra (PVC), among others, who ironically fought the Chinese in the same area around the Pangong Lake.

His citation read, "Major Thapa got out of his trench and killed several enemies in hand-to-hand fighting before he was finally overpowered by Chinese soldiers." The proud Gurkha had stared death in the eye and returned. Indeed, he was born in Dharamshala as many other Gurkhas in the region of Darjeeling Hills or Dehradun but he was as synonymously a Gurkha and an Indian as Mahavir Chakra (MVC) awardees like Tika Bahadur

Thapa, Pati Ram Gurung or a Prem Bahadur Gurung.

This unparalleled tradition and saga of sacrifice for India is reciprocated in a similar spirit by all those who chose to identify themselves as Gurkhas. In a deeply moving sight, a 11-year-old girl shouted the Gurkha war-cry on her father's cremation "Tiger 9 GR Ko! Ho Ki Hoina?" (Col MN Rai, the Tiger of 9 Gurkha Regiment, he was or wasn't he?) and it was responded by a resounding "Ho Ho Ho" (he was, he was, he was). The daughter and the nation mourned his loss and yet another name got etched to the list of the illustrious Gurkha glories. The inexplicable bond of the Indo-Nepalese reality underwrote that sacred spirit.

The "Gurkha" cannot and should not be sacrificed at the altar of partisan politics or the smallness of spirit that besets the times that be. Sadly, the over simplistic narrative of the day can easily affix the slant of "anti-national" on anyone owing to their ethnicities or religion as the basest instincts are easily aroused, tolerated and stoked by the powers-that-be.

Equally, the Nepalese dispensation cannot forget history and independent India's contributions or the essential implications that are imminent in choosing a China over India as its "bargaining tool." The people-to-people connect with

some other neighbouring countries has already been ruptured and irreversibly damaged with the context of politico-religiosity. This has done an extreme disservice to some of our own, who axiomatically got associated as "anti-nationals" owing to their co-religiosity. Ironically, such an ethnic pejoration onto the identity of the "Gurkha" would be a unique failure. This despite the supposed commonalities of the two realms.

Field Marshal Sam Manekshaw identified himself as a proud Gurkha as does the current Chief of Defence Staff or the Chief of Indian Army Staff prior to him. In a reciprocal dignity, the chiefs of both armies also bestow Honorary "Generalship" of their Armies, mutually. The national leadership has to make a concerted effort to ensure that no untoward or over-excitement is implied on the loyalty, fidelity and character of the people of Nepal. Balance ecology and economy

The rapid clearances of projects in order to promote industries are proving to be a death knell for the environment

The Coronavirus pandemic has not only killed lakhs of people worldwide, it has sickened the global economy, too, as nations have been forced to shut down their industries and businesses in order to stem the spread of the contagion. India, with its 9,39,192 Coronavirus cases and 24,327 casualties is no exception to this need to hunker down. And the country, which had begun to open up in a phased manner after an extended, hard lockdown, is being forced to impose brief shutdowns again. Naturally, this COVID-19 chokehold over the economy has put developmental projects, industry, trade and business in a coma and impacted thousands of lives and livelihoods.

The worst affected of the lot have been the migrant workers of the nation, who are rightly considered the silent contributors to development. The labour community, who at the best of times is neither appreciated enough nor remunerated fairly, continued to suffer even more badly during the COVID-19 lockdown. This was tragically epitomised by the horrid accident in Aurangabad where unemployed, exhausted and broke labourers walking back home were mowed down by a train after they went off to sleep on the tracks. The incident had sparked off a nationwide outrage and sense of grief for the sufferings of the workers in the informal economy.

Now, with the country slowly opening up, despite the Coronavirus cases skyrocketing, the very same labourers are being coaxed to come back from their villages and get the wheels of the economy moving again. That brings us to the fact that no matter what happens, even during a pandemic, an economy cannot be stopped in its tracks, it has to keep ticking. The economy is given precedence over everything, and this includes the environment, which is the proverbial poor cousin.

But in this bid to restart the economy, India is probably committing the same mistake all over again by making trade, business and industry a priority and putting the environment and ecological concerns on the back-burner. Unfortunately, this lopsided agenda of promoting economic development at the cost of the environment has heightened the risk of more pandemics such as the COVID-19 occurring frequently in future. In a stark but positive contrast, this aspect has been understood by the western world whose nations are quickly scrambling to cover their ecological deficiencies and environmental weak spots by ensuring that their economic development projects have a robust environmental compassion built in.

So, given these circumstances, it is natural to expect the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MoEFCC) to get into an overdrive and release a slew of measures that would herald the safeguarding of the environment in the current, COVID-19-stressed conditions. But this is not the case. Curiously, the Minister in charge for MoEFCC also happens to be in charge of the portfolio for Heavy Industries and Public Enterprises. In any other environmentally-conscious nation, this would have been perceived as a conflict of interest. But not in India. This anomaly notwithstanding, the MoEFCC recently went on a project clearance spree in 11 States.

These rapid clearances of projects in order to promote industries are proving to be a death knell for the environment. The MoEFCC, for instance, cleared a railway line in Telangana that cuts through 168 hectares of a prime forest, which also happens to be a tiger reserve. In this case, the Government could have considered an elevated track to spare the trees but this was obviously not done. The Etalin Hydropower project in Arunachal Pradesh's Dibang Valley is yet another example of sheer indifference towards the environment. The project entails the diversion of 1,150 hectares of forest land that will cause the felling of a whopping 2,70,000 trees.

This kind of ruin of nature cannot be justified at all, no matter what the gains are. Numerous representations from environmental activists and scientists have been able to stall the final approval of the project, but it is surprising how the project was conceived in the first place, given the scale of environmental destruction. In the midst of baffling examples such as these is yet another instance of environmental neglect. This is the proposed hydel project in Uttarakhand that involves compromising 768 acres of forest land.

The Government must realise that the environment cannot be pawned off for industrial gains. Repeated announcements of projects that threaten the environment will keep inviting representations from the environmental and scientific community to roll back these projects. Parallely, the nation will slowly but surely understand the apathy of the Government towards the environment and this will be the end of the trust people have in the Government. This kind of knee-jerk conception and approval of projects with utter disregard for the environment is detrimental to national interests and cannot be allowed to proliferate.

As a first step to stem this, the Government must ensure that the environment and heavy industries ministries are not represented by the same person. This will ensure that there is no conflict of interest and decisions taken in one Ministry will not result in collateral damage for the other. The current trying times are a great opportunity for India to reaffirm its commitment towards the environment and this must be shown through actions rather than words. This can be done only by effectively balancing the ecology with the economy.

Beware of an injured Xi

If Jinping is able to overcome the domestic challenges he faces now, he would emerge a dictator. India, therefore, has to be prepared for a probability of re-occurrence of aggression on its borders

President Xi Jinping's ambition to make China an undisputed global superpower has changed the entire geo-political dynamics. The phenomenal rise of Xi has made China more aggressive. He has emerged as the most powerful leader of China after Mao Zedong. Born in a politically-influential family in 1953, he witnessed the Mao era closely and saw the ruthless face of Zedong when his father was purged and jailed during the 1966-76 Cultural Revolution. Though his father was rehabilitated after the death of Mao, these events left a long-lasting impression on his mind which got further hardened during Xi's initial struggle within the Communist Party which he joined in 1974. He spent decades working his way up the party and Government ranks but his consolidation of power since becoming General Secretary, the head of the party, in 2012 has been unprecedented. In 2013, he also became the President of the Peoples' Republic of China (PRC), thus assuming charge of all the three most-coveted posts in the party and Government. He represents the new generation of Chinese because he is the first General Secretary born after the establishment of the PRC. Xi today is the President of PRC without term limits. Incidentally, he now has 12 posts that give him control and oversight over most areas of Government, the economy and military. Xi, therefore, is the most authoritarian world leader today, who is ruthless with any form of opposition to him at home and visualises himself as a potential supreme leader of the world.

It goes to the credit of Xi that during his tenure China has grown economically and militarily. China surpassed Japan to become the second-largest economy in the world and global manufacturing hub. He effected a large-scale purge in the military brass to end corruption in the People's Liberation Army (PLA). This was followed by structural reforms to make PLA a lean and modern fighting force with emphasis on mastering the three domains of cyber world, space and information.

Xi proved to be a leader who can rise to challenges. But his bitter experience during the Cultural Revolution has made him an authoritarian man who does not trust anyone. He abhors challenge to his authority or to his "Chinese Dream" of national rejuvenation. Thus, he has crushed dissent in Hong Kong, Xinjiang and Tibet. In pursuance of his Middle Kingdom ambition, he has refused to accept international laws and treaties and persisted with expansionist designs in the South China Sea (SCS), East China Sea (ECS) while continuing with salami-slicing in the neighbourhood to include India, Nepal and Bhutan. His ambition to be a global leader has led to a no holds barred conflict with the sole superpower, the US. Xi is convinced that the main rival of China is the US and all others are mere pushovers and that has determined his behaviour and actions as far as the disputes in the SCS, the Sino-India border and disputes with South Korea, Japan and Taiwan are concerned.

All was going well for Xi till the outbreak of the Coronavirus. The ongoing trade war with the US was also tilted in his favour till the pandemic spread across the world with its roots in China. All of a sudden Xi was being attacked globally as well as domestically. The strong Chinese economy began to show signs of crumbling. The demand for closing factories in China and relocating them grew louder by the day. India was being considered a probable alternative. The US seized the opportunity and led the global offensive against China, accusing Xi of deliberately delaying the information regarding the outbreak. The global economy was in the doldrums with nations resorting to prolonged lockdowns and most countries blaming China for the contagion.

Xi's dream of the 21st century belonging to China began to crumble gradually. His plan of end-

ing poverty in China by 2020 suffered the biggest setback and it emerged as his toughest year. Xi's unchallenged status at home came under threat and in order to divert attention he began to pursue an aggressive policy to portray Chinese supremacy. He let loose his "wolf warrior" diplomats to counter the global diplomatic and political onslaught. Simultaneously, he began to flex muscles in the SCS and ECS. He started the process of gaining complete control over Hong Kong, denouncing the "One Nation Two Systems" promise. The regime change in Taiwan, too, annoyed Xi. He began to behave like a medieval king eager to extend frontiers and win glory.

Challenging India in the trans-Himalayan icy battlefield was meant to teach New Delhi a lesson for challenging the Chinese ownership of Aksai Chin. China was convinced that New Delhi would not challenge its occupation of Aksai Chin till the Indian Home Minister roared in the Parliament that his reference to Ladakh included Gilgit-Baltistan and Aksai Chin. It rattled Beijing more than Pakistan because it could afford to lose neither of the two.

Despite China's denial, the world community noted with concern the sinking of Vietnamese fishing boats in the SCS, the unilateral decision to name new Chinese districts in the area, sanctions against Australia, browbeating of Japan in the ECS, unilateral actions in Hong Kong, Ladakh incursions, manipulation of Nepal, claims on the Sakteng Wildlife Sanctuary in Eastern Bhutan and on the Siberian town of Vladivostok.

Buoyed by the passive response of other nations, Xi ventured to provoke India at Galwan Heights expecting meek submission. But the brawl at those icy heights on the night of June 15 not only took the Chinese by surprise but also put the fear of God in its soldiers about the fighting prowess of Indian soldiers. The Chinese plan to teach India a lesson not only backfired but the Galwan face-off proved to be a turning point, which may well turn out to be a reason for renewed vengeance. The global community acknowledged India standing up to the bully and paying him back in the same coin. India followed it up with an econom-

ic offensive as well. The changed scenario had a ripple effect. China's victims realised that the dragon could be held off.

ASEAN nations for the first time spoke in unison, asking China to follow international laws on maritime boundaries. Japan reacted offensively by deploying near the disputed islands, Bhutan vehemently asserted its claim over Sakteng Wildlife Sanctuary and refused to be cowed down, Russia agreed to fast track arms supplies to India, the US moved three aircraft carriers in the SCS, Australia refused to take Chinese students and broke trade ties with it.

The Chinese economy, too, suffered a big blow, putting greater pressure on Xi. Following the Indian ban of 59 Chinese apps, cancellation of contracts signed with Chinese companies in the telecom, construction and MSME sectors and the growing demand for boycott of Chinese goods, other nations, too, began to ban Chinese technology firms. Chinese giant Huawei has been the biggest sufferer. Similarly, the dream project of Xi, the Belt Road Initiative (BRI), has come under severe strain with many countries either abandoning various projects or demanding a review of their loan agreements.

The list of Xi's woes is growing by the day. China had become an economic superpower by the time Xi took power but his critics now blame him for leading the country to ruin due to his aggressive, expansionist policies and ambition.

After aggressive posturing following the Galwan face-off, China has now agreed to a negotiated settlement on the border so that he doesn't lose the war against the international community as well. India and China agreed that differences should not become disputes after a telephonic discussion between the Indian National Security Advisor and the Chinese Foreign Minister.

Though China has agreed to a phased disengagement and de-escalation, there is a big trust deficit between the two armies now. The overwhelming opinion in India is that disengagement is not enough in order to end tensions on the Line of Actual Control (LAC). They advocate no de-escalation until full return of status quo. While Xi would fight his own battle for survival, we have to ensure that it is not yet another

er Chinese trap.

History tells us that China is untrustworthy. Be it 1962, Suktong Chu, Depsang or Doklam. This time, too, we are not yet sure if the Chinese move is a tactical retreat in order to achieve its bigger strategic aim. Hence, India should not be lulled into complacency. History tells us that our political leadership has failed to understand the insurance provided to a nation's growth economically and diplomatically by strong security forces. Hence, payment of annual premium to ensure that the insurance does not lapse is mandatory. The nation has to be prepared to ward off physical threats to its borders and also those in the cyber world, space and the information highways.

India must not let its guard down on the borders along the Line of Control (LoC) and the LAC. At the same time all actions taken to supplement the armoury of the three services should not be halted but put on fast track to ensure that if the dragon dares to threaten us again, it is taught a lesson forever. If needed, we should be prepared to stay put even during the harsh winters, for which logistics and catering preparations have to begin forthwith.

Economic strangulation of China should continue while at the same time encouraging friendly nations to do the same. On the diplomatic front, apart from consolidating Chinese isolation due to the pandemic, India should also consider denouncing Beijing's One Nation Policy and leverage numerous fault lines in China by exposing its high-handedness in grabbing the territories in its periphery. Free Tibet movement should be given an impetus in India. The democratic movements in Hong Kong and Taiwan need stronger Indian support.

If Xi is able to overcome the domestic challenges he faces now, he would emerge a dictator. India, therefore, has to be prepared for a probability of re-occurrence of Chinese aggression on its borders. We have to emerge as China's equal. Beijing will try its level best to lull us into complacency, it would be suicidal if we fall into China's trap again.

Minimally invasive surgery best in Corona era

Such procedures improve short-term outcomes in heart patients and are associated with a faster recovery in comparison with the traditional approach

The nation has been in lockdown mode for more than four months now and has only just started opening up. Hospitals, research and development (R&D) institutions are trying their best to bring out a vaccine for the Coronavirus. In fact, human trials for the vaccine have begun in India. We have seen many reports that have said that there has been a decline in the number of people opting for surgeries, especially low

and medium-risk patients. A lot of patients, who had surgeries scheduled, have postponed them and are avoiding hospital visits for routine checkups as they fear being exposed to the Coronavirus. There have been reports of people losing their lives due to a heart attack or stroke. Even though they had prior symptoms of heart disease, they did not venture out due to the fear of COVID-19.

It is extremely important for cardiac patients and people with heart conditions to take care of their health in such testing times, especially as there are a lot of restrictions on access to various facilities.

Exercising, maintaining a proper diet and taking the prescribed cardiac medication or anti-diabetes medicine are all very important for

patients, since these are the co-morbid conditions which make the COVID-19 infection serious as the cardiac/diabetes patients are already immuno-compromised. With that said, it is also impossible for high-risk patients with severe heart conditions to not opt for surgeries. When it is absolutely essential depending on the conditions, patients might have to undergo surgery.

The need to safeguard themselves and their patients has prompted most surgeons to develop their own protocols to tide over the pandemic situation. The decision for surgical care should be based on the doctor's own surgical and clinical judgment and assessment of resource availability. Patients should get the surgical care based on practice of evidence-based medicine. A non-operative line of

management is advised when it is clinically appropriate for patients, specially looking at risk and benefits of surgery.

Heart surgeries are arduous and long procedures that take a toll on patients physically and mentally. Open-heart surgeries are back breakingly expensive and procedures last for days. Since the surgical team has to be careful not to get infection, all the precautionary measures that are being practised are also the most rigorous for the surgical team. Apart from that, in the COVID-19 era, there is a dire need for minimum contact which is only possible through minimally-invasive surgical techniques. Minimally invasive surgery improves short-term outcomes in patients and it is associated with a faster recovery in comparison with the traditional

approach. If a patient needs valve replacement, then a trans catheter aortic valve replacement is an alternative, but the long-lasting results of these valves are still questionable. There is a certain amount of industry drive to make these procedures popular without really knowing the long-term results. I am sure that there are cardiologists who will object to this contention. But this remark is only because of the fact that I am one of the few surgeons in this country who has been replacing valves (single, double or treble since 1975) and hence I have experienced the long-term results of conventional valve replacement.

Currently these valves are highly expensive in India, going up to ₹22.5 lakh, owing to which this technology is not available for common Indians. Even the cost of convention-

al valve replacement, that is between ₹2.5 to ₹3 lakh, is not affordable for the common man. The solution for this dilemma is indigenisation. Some hospitals in the country have been in the forefront of bringing about indigenisation in Transcatheter Aortic Valve Implantation (TAVI) along with the National Aeronautical Laboratory and Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, using Nitinol stents. The valve material used is bovine jugular veins which is after all a waste. This could be a classic example of "waste to wealth, but unfortunately, there has been no support from any Central Government agencies such as the Department of Biotechnology, the Department of Science and Technology or any regulatory bodies.

Children with congenital heart

disease or structural heart disease undergo multiple heart surgeries in their lifetime. Of course, closing a hole in the heart through the Transcatheter route is available. Most of these patients who have these "corrections" can go home within 24 hours.

This reduces their risk of catching infection, which is vital in the COVID-19 era. This also means more beds will be available for elective patients who need such therapy, which does not need long-term hospitalisation. It is not the technology alone but the logistics, the patient's comfort and affordability of the procedure that are also important.

No plans to speak to Xi, says Trump

Washington: US President Donald Trump has indicated that he has no plan to speak with his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping, amid a war of words between the two countries on a range of issues and tit-for-tat sanctions on lawmakers and senior officials.

"No, I haven't spoken to him," Trump said in response to a reporter's question at a White House press conference on Tuesday.

"I have no plan to speak to him," the president said while expressing his anger over China's inability to prevent the spread of the coronavirus out of the country, from where it originated.

"Make no mistake, we hold China fully responsible for concealing the virus and unleashing it upon the world.

(They) could have stopped it, they should have stopped," Trump said as he also lashed out at WHO for siding with China on this issue.

"They were really a puppet of China," he said. Trump spoke to reporters after ending special privileges and economic treatment for Hong Kong and rescinding the territory's exception to bans on the importing of sensitive technologies.

He also signed into law bipartisan legislation that allows the US government to sanction individuals and entities known to be involved in interfering in Hong Kong's freedom. Beijing has condemned Washington's recent bid to reject its claims in the South China Sea as illegal and has retaliated against US visa restrictions on Chinese officials

in Xinjiang by founding senior senators and representatives.

At his presser, Trump also slammed former vice president Joe Biden, who is his Democratic Party challenger for being "soft" on China.

The China issue has become a leading election year topic as Trump and Biden each attempt to paint the other as weak in the face of aggressive moves from Beijing.

"By contrast, my administration acted very early to ban travel from China, from Europe, saving all of these lives. I want every citizen to know that we are using the full power of the federal government to fight that China virus and keep our people safe. Through Operation Warp Speed, we will deliver a vaccine in record-breaking time," he said. **PTI**

Will definitely hit back with sanctions if Trump implements new Hong Kong Act: China

China on Wednesday warned the US that it will "definitely hit back" with sanctions if Washington goes ahead with the implementation of President Donald Trump's 'Hong Kong Autonomy Act' to end the preferential treatment to the former British colony.

President Trump has signed an executive order to end the preferential economic treatment for Hong Kong after China introduced a controversial national security law in the Asian trading hub to curb autonomy and democratic freedoms.

Reacting to Trump's announcement of signing the 'Hong Kong Autonomy Act', Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Hua Chunying said the US should not implement it.

"We urge the US side to correct its mistake, not to implement the so-called 'Hong Kong Autonomy Act' and immediately stop meddling in Hong Kong affairs and China's internal affairs in any way," she told a media briefing here.

"This act smears our law on safeguarding national security in Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR). If the US insists on going on the wrong path, China will definitely hit back," she said.

China's aggressive actions against India give insight into how CPC thinking these days: US NSA

Washington: China's "very aggressive" actions against India, including the brutal attack on Indian soldiers in eastern Ladakh, and its moves in the South China Sea and Hong Kong give a "good insight" into how the ruling Communist Party of China is thinking these days, US National Security Advisor Robert O'Brien has said.

The Indian and Chinese Armies were locked in a standoff in multiple locations in eastern Ladakh since May 5. The tension escalated in the Galwan Valley on June 15 in which 20 Indian Army personnel were killed during a violent face-off with Chinese soldiers.

"The Chinese have been very aggressive with India," O'Brien said on Tuesday alleging that during the recent clash they beat some of the Indians so badly they were disfigured and could not be identified.

"This is a dispute between India and China, but China has shown itself for what it was. Chinese troops ambushed the Indians. They beat 20 Indians to death. They beat them so badly with clubs with nails in them and wrapped with concertina -- barbed wire," O'Brien told Fox News Radio in an interview. He was responding to a question on the

recent Chinese aggressive behaviour against India in eastern Ladakh.

Responding to a question on US-India bilateral relations, he said, India is a democracy and is a great friend of the United States.

Prime Minister Narendra "Modi and President (Donald) Trump have a super relationship," O'Brien said.

"In fact, it was the last foreign trip that I took with the president before the COVID crisis hit, was to India, and we had a great reception of the Indian people there. We have a lot in common with them, we speak English, we're democracies. We've got a growing, very strong relationship with India," O'Brien said.

"But China's action towards India, just like its actions in the South China Sea, just like what it's doing in Hong Kong, just like the bullying intimidation of Taiwan, really gives you a good insight into how the Communist Party of China is thinking these days," he said.

China claims almost all of the 1.3 million square mile South China Sea as its sovereign territory. China has been building military bases on artificial islands in the region also claimed by Brunei, Malaysia, the Philippines, Taiwan and Vietnam. **PTI**

Trump ends preferential economic treatment for HK

Washington: US President Donald Trump has signed an executive order to end the preferential economic treatment for Hong Kong after China imposed a controversial national security law in the Asian trading hub to curb autonomy and democratic freedoms.

The Trump administration has been openly critical of Beijing's sweeping national security law aimed at limiting Hong Kong's autonomy and curb political dissent against the ruling Chinese Communist Party.

Trump said he also signed legislation to sanction Chinese officials responsible for cracking down on political dissent in Hong Kong. "Today, I signed legislation and an executive order to hold China accountable for its oppressive actions against the people of Hong Kong,"

Trump said at a White House press conference on Tuesday.

The president also said he signed an executive order ending US preferential treatment for Hong Kong, a former British territory handed over to China in 1997. "Hong Kong will now be treated the same as mainland China. No special privileges, no special economic treatment and no export of sensitive technologies. In addition to that, as you know, we are placing massive tariffs and have placed very large tariffs on China.

"First time this has ever happened to China, billions of dollars have been paid to the US, of which I have given quite a bit to the farmers and ranchers of our country because they were targeted, and that has been going on for three years," he said. **PTI**

Banning TikTok takes big espionage tool away from China: US NSA

China will lose "a big tool" of espionage and surveillance if America and some western European countries ban Chinese apps like TikTok as done by India, US National Security Advisor Robert O'Brien has said.

India last month banned 59 Chinese apps, including TikTok and UC Browser, saying they were prejudicial to the sovereignty, integrity and security of the country.

O'Brien told Fox News Radio in an interview that the Trump administration was "very seriously taking a look" at TikTok, WeChat and some other apps coming out of China.

8-year-old Pak girl dies after being gangraped

An eight-year-old Pakistani girl died in a hospital on Wednesday after she was gangraped by two men in a village in Punjab province, sparking outrage among the locals who demanded public hanging of the rapists.

According to police, the girl, the daughter of a rickshaw driver, was playing outside her house on Monday at Buttar Dograan-Chawinda village in Sialkot district, some 130 kms from Lahore when two suspects gave her some intoxicant in juice and took her to a deserted place.

They gang-raped her and

tortured her.

The suspects fled when some locals reached there after hearing the child's screams. The girl was shifted to a hospital in Sialkot in a critical condition where she died on Wednesday due to excessive bleeding, police said.

The family and local residents held a demonstration and blocked a road to protest against the incident and police apathy. They demanded that the culprits be arrested and hanged publicly.

They ended the protest after the district police chief Mustansar Feroze told them that the accused have been arrested.

Russia lifts mandatory quarantine for arrivals

Moscow:

Russian authorities have lifted mandatory two-week self-quarantine for those arriving as part of easing coronavirus restrictions.

Starting Wednesday, both Russian and international travelers will have to either provide coronavirus test results at the border or take a test within three days of arrival in Russia.

Self-quarantine will remain mandatory for those who test positive for the virus or whose health deteriorates upon arrival.

It's one of several steps in an effort to reopen the country after health officials started reporting a slowdown in infections. Last month, authorities allowed travel abroad for the purpose of work, studying, medical treatment or taking care of relatives. They also let foreigners with work permits or those seeking medical treatment or taking care of family members into the country.

Last week, Deputy Prime Minister Tatyana Golikova said Russia may resume international flights starting Wednesday, adding that the final decision would depend on the outcome of negotiations with other countries.

On Tuesday night, Belarus Prime Minister Roman Golovchenko announced reopening of the border with Russia and resuming transport ties between the two countries in the coming days. **AP**

Biden announces \$2 trillion climate plan, vows to rejoin Paris deal

PTI ■ WASHINGTON

Democratic presidential nominee Joe Biden has unveiled a USD 2 trillion proposal to boost investment in clean energy and combat the global warming as he pledged to rejoin the historic Paris agreement on climate change if elected in the November elections.

US President Donald Trump in 2017 withdrew the United States, the world's No 2 emitter of greenhouse gases behind China, from the 2015 Paris Climate Agreement that brought countries together to mitigate global warming, saying it was too costly.

Biden has said he will return the US to a leadership role on climate change, assertively re-entering the United States in future climate negotiations to advance the goals of the Paris Climate Agreement.

"We're going to reverse Trump's rollbacks of 100 public health and environmental rules -- and then forge a path to greater ambition. We're going to get back into the Paris Agreement -- and back into the business of leading the world," Biden said in a major policy address on climate change, which he said poses a serious threat to the mankind.

2020 will mark 'inflection point' in India-UK healthcare collaboration: Indian diplomat

London: The year 2020 will witness an "inflection point" in the UK-India healthcare collaboration as the Covid-19 pandemic has brought collaboration in medicine to the centrestage, outgoing Consul General of India in Birmingham Dr Aman Puri has said.

In an interview to *PTI* on the eve of his departure from the West Midlands region of England, Puri reflected on the recently-launched West Midlands India Partnership

(WMIP) to boost India-UK investment flows and flagged the healthcare sector as a particular focus of bilateral ties amid the coronavirus pandemic.

"My sense is that 2020 will witness an inflection point in the UK-India healthcare collaboration. Covid-19 has brought healthcare centerstage, and the need for collaborations has been realised by all stakeholders more than ever before," said Puri. **PTI**

Coronavirus resurgence forces countries to reimpose restrictions

Promachonas (Greece): Countries around the world are reimposing lockdowns and implementing new health checks at their borders in an effort to curb a resurgence of the coronavirus before it spins even further out of control.

Starting Wednesday, all travellers arriving in Greece from a land border with Bulgaria were required to carry negative coronavirus test results issued in the previous 72 hours and translated into English. The new rules, which follow an increase in tourism-related Covid-19 cases, triggered an immediate drop in arrivals compared to recent days. Residents of Australia's second-largest city, Melbourne, were warned on Wednesday to comply with lockdown regulations or face tougher restrictions.

Melbourne's 5 million people and part of the city's semi-rural surroundings are a week into a new, six-week lockdown

Google to buy 7.7% stake in Jio; to make affordable smartphones

Google has agreed to invest ₹33,737 crore for a 7.7 per cent stake in Reliance Industries' technology venture and to cooperate on technology initiatives, including development of affordable smartphones, billionaire Mukesh Ambani said on Wednesday.

Addressing RIL's first-ever online annual general meeting, which had an unprecedented 3.2 lakh shareholders attending from 550 cities in 48 countries through the newly-minted JioMeet platform, he said Reliance Jio has developed an indigenous 5G solution which can be exported globally.

Also, the group's petrochemical and retail business has received strong interest from financial and strategic investors on lines of the massive ₹1.52 lakh crore that the technology venture Jio Platforms amassed in less than three months from the likes of Facebook and Google.

The only disappointment for investors was on the company's talks for a sale of a 20 per cent stake in oil-to-chemical (O2C) business to Saudi Aramco for an asking of USD 15 billion, with Ambani saying talks have "not progressed as per the original timeline". He, however, hastened to add that the company has raised enough money from stake sale in Jio Platforms and fuel retailing



business as well as a rights issue to achieve the net-debt free target nine months ahead of schedule. Achieving net-debt free status was one of the objectives behind Asia's richest man announcing stake sale talks on O2C business to Aramco in the company's last annual general meeting in August 2019.

On Wednesday, he neither said if the talks with Aramco were on track nor did he give a new deadline.

All he said was that RIL, operator of the world's largest refining complex, will replace transportation auto fuels with clean electricity and hydrogen as it set a target to become net carbon-zero by 2035.

"We are delighted to welcome Google as a strategic investor in Jio Platforms. We have signed a binding partnership and an investment agreement under which Google will invest ₹

mer for Rs 7,629 crore will help the company become net debt-free, Ambani said.

The cumulative fund raising by Reliance is less than three months is now ₹2,12,809 crore as compared to net debt of ₹1,61,035 crore as on March 31, 2020.

Ambani, who has catapulted his way to become the sixth richest man in the world with USD 72.4 billion, surpassing Tesla's Elon Musk and Alphabet co-founders Sergey Brin and Larry Page, said his group can "design entry-level 4G or even 5G smartphone for a fraction of its current cost".

"Google and Jio are partnering to build an Android-based smartphone operating system," he said. "Through this partnership, we are confident that we can accelerate the national mission of putting a smart device in the hands of every Indian."

As many as 350 million Indians still use a 2G feature phone. "Our mission with Android has always been to bring the power of computing to everyone, and we've been humbled by the way Indians have embraced Android over recent years," said Google chief executive Sundar Pichai.

"The time is right to increase our commitment to India significantly, in collaboration with local companies, and partnership with Jio is the

first step."

Google and Jio are partnering to build an Operating System that could power affordable 4G/5G smartphone. Also, JioMart, online shopping portal, and WhatsApp will be working closely to enable customers seamlessly transact with mom-and-pop stores.

He also announced

broadband for enterprises and small businesses and Narrowband Internet-of-Things (NB-IoT). Jio Platforms - which is also amassing a wide range of services from music streaming to online retail and payments - is expected to use its 388 million mobile phone subscribers as the cornerstone of an e-commerce and digital services busi-

ness to rival Amazon and Walmart's Flipkart.

Jio, which is at the centre of Ambani's ambition to create a homegrown technology behemoth akin to China's Alibaba, has become Reliance's growth engine, combining with the company's fast-growing retail arm to help in offsetting the decline in oil and petrochemicals.

The oil-telecom-to-retail conglomerate also announced acceleration in the rollout of JioMart - its e-commerce venture.

"We have received strong interest from strategic and financial investors in Reliance Retail. We will induct global partners and investors in Reliance Retail in the next few quarters," he said.

Facebook-owned instant messaging platform WhatsApp, which is immensely popular in India, has been testing a payments platform in

India for quite some time now.

"Over 400 million WhatsApp users in India bring unique value to our partnership," Ambani said at the company's first annual general meeting.

In India, there are more than 15 million monthly WhatsApp Business app users.

"Both Facebook and Jio share a strong vision for digitally empowering consumers as well as small businesses and entrepreneurs across India," the RIL Chairman said. In April, Facebook had announced a \$5.7 billion, or ₹43,574 crore, investment in Jio Platforms.

Markets eke out gains in volatile trade; RIL selloff weighs


The Sensex and Nifty surrendered most of the day's gains to end marginally higher on Wednesday, pressured by a lag-end selloff in heavy-weight Reliance Industries.

During the day, the 30-share BSE Sensex rallied 777 points, driven by positive sentiment across global markets on hopes of a COVID-19 vaccine.

The index, however, made a U-turn in the last hour of trade and settled just 18.75 points, or 0.05 per cent, higher at 36,051.81.

On similar lines, the NSE Nifty closed 10.85 points, or 0.10 per cent, up at 10,618.20, after soaring 220 points during the session.

Reliance Industries was the biggest drag on the Sensex, skidding 3.71 per cent after scaling its life-time high of ₹1,978.50 (intra-day) as investors rushed to book profits amid a slew of announcements at its annual general meeting. RIL Chairman Mukesh Ambani said Google will invest ₹33,737 crore to buy 7.7 per cent stake in Jio Platforms, completing RIL's capital-raising target for the digital arm. Ambani also announced Jio is developing a homegrown 5G telecom solution, but added that his group's



phase of human trials.

However, the flag-end selloff in RIL halted the rally, they said. "The stock price of Reliance has witnessed a decline towards the end of the AGM since most of the news was already priced in and there were not many surprises," said Nirali Shah, Senior Research Analyst, Samco Securities.

Ajit Mishra, VP - Research, Religare Broking Ltd, added, "We're seeing a tussle between the bulls and bears for the last couple of sessions and we feel it would be healthy if the market witnesses some correction after the recent surge. However, the resilience of global markets would help the index to limit the downside."

Sanitisers soaps, not medicaments; will attract higher 18% GST

Amid the ongoing debate over goods and services tax (GST) rate on hand sanitisers, the government on Wednesday clarified alcohol-based hand sanitisers will continue to be levied at the standard rate of 18 per cent as the product is a disinfectant like soaps and not a medicament.

With the Consumer Affairs Ministry having classified hand sanitisers as essential commodities in wake of Covid-19 pandemic, there had been a demand from certain sections of the industry, particularly liquor and sugar sectors, to classify sanitisers in the medicament category attracting lower 12 per cent duty.

"It is stated that hand sanitisers attract GST at the rate of 18 per cent.

Sanitisers are disinfectants like soaps, anti-bacterial liquids, Dettol etc, all of which attract duty at the standard rate of 18 per cent under the GST regime," a Finance Ministry statement said.

"It is further clarified that inputs for manufacture of hand

sanitisers are chemicals, packing material, input services, which also attracts a GST rate of 18 per cent. Reducing the GST rate on sanitisers and other similar items would lead to an inverted duty structure and put the domestic manufacturers at disadvantage vis-a-vis importers," the statement added.

Earlier, the Goa bench of the GST Authority for Advance Ruling (AAR) also held that the alcohol-based hygiene products will attract 18 per cent GST. It added that its classification as an essential commodity cannot be a criteria for exemption from GST.

The order came on a petition from Springfields (India) Distilleries over classification of the hand sanitiser and the applicable rate of GST.

The clarity has also come in wave of reports of large-scale tax evasion reported by the Central Economic Intelligence Bureau with certain new manufacturers of sanitisers paying 12 per cent GST due to the wrong classification instead of the actual 18 per cent.

For alcohol, had any of us thought that there would be a falling graph, ever? The global data suggests that due to the ongoing pandemic, the beer market has seen a shift in consumer preferences towards low and non-alcoholic variants as well as craft beer. Well, who had thought this would change.

The report titled, *India Beer Market — Industry Size, Share, Drivers, Trends, Analysis and Forecasts (2019-24)*, released by Niir Project Consultancy Services, provides a comprehensive analysis on the Indian beer market.


As per the data, India has one of the lowest consumption levels of beer in Asia. Currently, India consumes about two per cent of the total world volumes and has the potential to match the world leader, China, thus opening a vast pool of opportunities for the brewing companies. However, changing dynamics of Indian preferences, favourable demographics, growing awareness and acceptability of alcohol, rising per capita income and evolving cultural attitude are some of the key factors, which are likely to contribute to sales.

NO MORE HARD CHOICES

Looking at the manufacturing process of beer, from malting till the end of process at bottling, the beer segment in India is categorised either by fermentation process (ale & lager) or by alcohol's volume (mild & strong). The Indian industry is majorly dominated by strong beer but new flavourful mild beer are finding their feet on the ground. While strong beer has alcohol content of not less than five per cent, mild beer contains not more than five per cent of alcohol. Even though beer is being increasingly accepted as a social drink and the urban youth in particular favours it as the preferred alcoholic beverage, the Indian market has been highly dominated by hard liquor. However, consumers are now looking for choices away from whisky.

RISING ACCEPTABILITY & HOME DELIVERIES

It is not just the male populace that is enamoured by beer but women equal-



ly enjoy the beverage today. One of the drivers for the beer industry is the rising online alcohol-delivery. A sudden spurt of such portals not only indicates the rising acceptability of alcohol in the country but also the much evolving consumer base. The consumers, who were unable to go to a liquor store earlier, especially women, now purchase their preferred drinks and are in a sweet spot with home deliveries.

However, the industry still faces moral restrictions due to great religious influences. It is still considered to be a forbidden, taboo drink in some parts of the society, detrimental for Indian culture. Drinking alcohol is culturally not accepted in most parts of the country.

CRAFT BEER, THE NEW RAGE

The Indian beer market has also been experiencing the trend of microbreweries and exclusive beer spots. The emergence of such outlets has contributed to an increased awareness and easy availability of beer in Indian markets. Today, craft beer is a rage in the industry and is booming. The market is swamped with a number of craft beer with new and innovative flavours. Beer consumers are nowadays shifting their preferences from regular mainstream bottled beer to artisanal brews, new fresh flavours and unique local ingredients. A large number of microbreweries are also selling their bottled craft beer. The surge in craft beer sales is intended to drive the beer industry sales to the bub-



bly top!

THE ZERO BEER

One of the recent trends to hit the industry is emergence of zero per cent beer. Since the consumer profile for beer industry in India is evolving, so is the preference meter and hence the emergence of new varieties. Consumers are now increasingly opting for drinks that are low on sugar, carbs and hence, calories. In view of an increasing demand for such drinks, a lot of brewers have come

up with their versions of zero per cent beer to tap the demand from this segment. Players have been branching out into concepts such as non-alcohol brand extensions and surrogate advertising and alignment with sport.


A RECESSION-PROOF BEVERAGE

The report also scrutinises the Indian beer industry with the help of SWOT Analysis, elucidating the strengths of the industry in being recession-proof in view of the fact that alco-

hol consumption generally remains unfazed by the economic downturn. Also, the growing Indian population serves as a ready customer base for the beer industry. According to the United Nations, India is poised to overtake China as the world's most populous nation around 2027. Such population growth puts the industry in a comfortable spot. Indian demographics are bound to benefit the industry in the long term with large number of people under drinkable age. With rising urbanisation, escalating disposable income and growing affluent class, there are enormous opportunities for the players to tap into. It is estimated that the urban population in India will rise to 38 per cent of the total population by 2025.

CHALLENGES IN GROWTH

However, the industry faces challenges in the form of ban on direct advertising and derisory state of market infrastructure. The industry is also highly taxed, regulated and struggles with multiplicity of taxes. With global bigwigs like Carlsberg, Anheuser-Busch and Heineken entering the country, the competitive landscape of the domestic beer market has changed considerably. However, given the above growth triggers of beer — acceptability, popularity of microbreweries and craft beer and evolving consumer preferences — the industry is expected to reach consumption levels of 3,584 million litres or 459 million cases by 2024.



COVID AS HER MUSE

Artist **GUNJAN TYAGI**'s new paintings have been inspired by the feelings of isolation, confusion, boredom and the ongoing pandemic. By **TEAM VIVA**

While the world experiences strife through isolation, boredom, panic and uncertainty, yet, for those, who pick up a paint brush or pen in response to the disease, their role as a change-maker in society becomes very important. It has been rightly said that art and creativity in the time of a pandemic is more crucial than ever! Going by the references and examples of art from the time of the great Plague, poet Richard Kenney said that the Plague had changed the imagination of the West. It changed every culture that is passed through. Well, that's what a creative piece of artwork does. For future generations, it stands as an evidence that this happened.

Marking 2020 in history, Delhi-based artist Gunjan Tyagi creates three 'paintings on COVID-19' that aim to reflect the current relationship between humans and nature, and their battle with the Coronavirus pandemic.

The first, *Prerequisite*, as she explains, finds meaning in the touch of a human — which has currently gone missing. The work is a spin on Michelangelo's *Creation of Adam*. Talking about how she made it, she earlier recalled about how she recently made New York her home and that she found the city's energy and vibrance "truly stimulating." However, after a pandemic at hand, she added, "I found myself confined to my studio. I started re-focussing my energies on painting. But, true to contemporary anxieties, we see that both god and humans are wearing hand gloves!" The painting showcases two gloved hands



not being to able to touch each other. She says, "The creation of Adam is one of the most powerful, intimate and awe-inspiring pieces of art. Touch being the most significant act here,

which is untouched. Yet, it portrays that the spark exists, even though we can't see it, just like the instant which signifies the birth of humankind. The same powerful spiritual image has another meaning in these complex times — when the human touch and smiles on faces have gone missing. We are surrounded by fear, anxiety and depression. We are living in a time when all we really want is that touch, that spark to relive, to say the unsaid things, to rejoice and to cherish the moments of what we have lost and what we have."

The second painting, titled, *Quarantined*, is inspired by perhaps what is now the 'word of the year.' The painting showcases a girl who keeps her hair braid in front of her face rather than at the back.

She explains, "This very small work was done in the beginning of the pandemic situation. This was the response of the news and information we were surrounded with. It reminded me how boredom feels and one has that empty mind which they use in useless things at such times. People swamped on social media, YouTube, TikTok (which is now banned in India) and were busy doing stupid things. Things which have little happiness, things which make others laugh and keep everyone engaged."

The third, *Gaze*, is a portrait of a friend. She says, "I am trying to create a strange gaze on her face which is on society and its system, currently," questioning and trying to come to terms with the uncertainty around.

'Want to change mindsets'

Actor **Ayushmann Khurrana** has emerged as a thought-leader with his thought-provoking scripts that are based on topics which are considered a taboo. With eight back to back hits with such scripts, the actor aims to entertain audience with message-based films that have no reference point in Bollywood.


His brand equity today stands for backing the best quirky content that is being made by the industry. He played a sperm donor in his debut film *Vicky Donor*, someone with erectile dysfunction in *Shubh Mangal Saavdhaan*, dived into India's fragmented and sensitive caste politics in *Article 15*, and a gay character in *Shubh Mangal Zyada Saavdhaan*. He even highlighted body shaming in *Dum Laga Ke Haisha* and promoted inclusivity and body positivity in *Bala*.

Ayushmann says, "I have always tried to choose films that have no reference points and I have done this deliberately. I have gravitated towards hand-picking social dramas in my quest to give films that can hopefully impact change in mindset, communities and of course attitude.

These topics were hardly touched upon by our industry because we generally, consciously like to shy away from speaking publicly about these issues."

The star wants society and Bollywood to be more vocal about important issues that can help promote diversity and inclusivity. He says, "We aren't very vocal about some important and real issues that we should actually be talking about and discussing more often. I have always felt that bringing such topics out in the open will help us grow as a country."

Ayushmann adds, "I will continue on my journey to make as much positive change happen around me as possible. That's my biggest motivation as an artist."




CHHATTISGARH CM APPROVES GODHAN-NYAY-YOJANA

The Chhattisgarh cabinet, which is chaired by Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, approved Godhan Nyay Yojana. It has been done to make gauthans, sanctioned under Narva, Garua, Ghurua aur Bari Yojana, more employment-oriented. The scheme will be started in the state from Hareli festival. Till date, nearly 5,300 gauthans have been sanctioned, out of which the construction of 2,408 in rural areas and 377 in urban areas has completed. And this scheme will be started from these newly-built cowsheds (gauthan).

"In these gauthans, cowdung will be procured from cow and buffalo owners through gauthan samitis and the procured cowdung will be utilised to make vermicompost and other products. This will not only promote organic farming but will also create new employment opportunities, encourage protection of cows stop open grazing and will expand the double crop area, creating source of extra income of livestock owners," read the government release.

The Cabinet Committee recommended procurement of cowdung at the rate of ₹1.50 per kg from livestock owners in villages with cowsheds (gauthan). Cabinet approved the cowdung procurement rate at ₹2 per kg, including the transport cost.

The Cabinet has also decided to merge remaining batch of teachers (panchayat



and urban body cadre) who have completed service period of two years or more, under School Education Department from November 1, 2020. This will benefit approximately 16,278 teachers.

It also decided to distribute five kg rice, one kg chickpeas per person per month from July 2020 to November 2020 on ration cards (except APL category) issued under the Chhattisgarh Food Security Act, the same way is provided

on the ration cards of the National Food Security Act. In this regard, the maximum entitlement of total food grains per person / card per month will be equal to the maximum entitlement of food grains issued under CGFS and NFSA.

The Chhattisgarh Government has decided to reimburse the equivalent amount of State Goods and Services Tax (SGST) payable for admission on the screening

of the film Chhapak. They have decided to finalise the rates for all the works related to drinking water supply facility in all the villages of the state through tender procedure, collected via invitation for Expression of Interest under Jal Jeevan Mission. Cabinet has decided to ensure implementation of the mission via select agencies.

Draft of Chhattisgarh Rent Control (Amendment) Ordinance 2020 has been approved for amendment in Chhattisgarh Rent Control Act 2011. Under this, State Government will appoint retired judge of High Court or retired District Judge as Chairman of Rent Control Tribunal.

The Cabinet also gave its assent to formation of Chhattisgarh Sanskriti Parishad, ensuring uniformity in all the units conducted under Culture Department. Chief Minister will be the chairman of this council and Culture Minister will be the Vice-Chairman. They permitted establishment of bio-ethanol product units in the state on Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode under special incentive package of the state's Industrial Fund 2019-24.

Chhattisgarh State Industrial Development Corporation Ltd (CSIDC) approved the policy of purchasing private land with mutual consent for industrial purpose.

'Development is a continuous process'

Rajasthan State Industrial Development and Investment Corporation (RIICO) plays a role of catalyst in industrial development of the state. It facilitates investors and entrepreneurs in site selection, getting financial assistance to small, medium and large scale projects, getting government clearances and extends incentives and concessions according to the policies of the state government. Here is our interview with RIICO MD, Ashutosh AT Pednekar. Excerpts:

What is the situation of industries in Rajasthan during the pandemic?

It is a challenging time. The priority is to restore the pre-corona situation of the production level. The biggest issue is the creation of sufficient demand to start the production.

What is RIICO doing to lure investments?

There is a lot of movement in investment at the international level. RIICO, along with European Business Group Federation, had discussions with various international companies and chambers of commerce from different countries including USA, Japan etc. Besides luring international investments, we are trying to attract domestic investments in the state too. We are attracting sector specific investments. Refinery with an estimated cost of ₹ 56,000 crore is coming up at Pachadra in Barmer district. Lot of ancillary units of plastic, petrochemicals will come up here. With restrictions on import of toys and sports goods, RIICO is coming up with sports/toys zone at Khushkhara in Alwar district. There is big scope for ceramics and glass sector. Also, a zone is coming up at Soniyana in Chittaurgarh district where gas and raw material is available. Similarly, we are looking into the field of defence production as Rajasthan has army and air force base. Bharat Electricals Limited (BEL) has set up its unit in Jodhpur for defence production. There is huge scope for Maintenance, Repair and Overhauling (MRO) of defence equipment, so MRO units can be set here. Apart from these, RIICO is looking into gems and jewellery, FinTech (Financial and



Technical) services including others. To reduce the cost of investors, we have started allotting smaller plots of 250 to 750 square metres to micro, small enterprises. Earlier, the plots offered were of 1000-1500 sqmts. Along with this, entrepreneurs are offered loans facilities such as Mudra Loan etc. These small plots are being given at Raghunathpura industrial area in Jaipur district and at Uniaara in Tonk district. We are also offering Plug & Play facilities, in which there is multi-storey building where manufacturing can be done by taking space on rent. This will reduce the investment of the entrepreneur due to availability of common facilities, there will be ease of entry and exit too. All these steps were important during the COVID situation.

What is the situation of labourers...

Most of the labourers working outside the state have come back to their homes. The labour and industry departments have made a database of the skills, address and phone number of these workers. All the industry associations have been told about the availability of labourers as per their requirement. Rajasthan State Livelihood Development Corporation is also imparting training to the labourers.

It seems that industrial development is taking place in NCR, and along the Jaipur-Delhi highway. Is there similar development in process in other districts too?

Yes, industrial development has taken place in NCR and on Jaipur-Delhi highway due to the logistics. Besides this, industrial development has taken place in Udaipur, Jodhpur, Pali, Bhilwara and Kota. The Pachpadra refinery will bring in a huge industrial change. RIICO is also coming up with 20 new industrial areas in 16 districts in this financial year.

What has been the response of webinar with multinational companies?

The response has been quite encouraging. Many companies want to do MoU with us but prior to that they want to visit personally. It is getting delayed because of restrictions on operation of international flight services due to Coronavirus.

What has been industrial development during the Congress regime in last 18 months?

Industrial development is a continuous process. Last one year has been historical for RIICO, as sale of plots has increased by 325 per cent as compared to previous years.

India at a far better place: Naqvi

Senior BJP leader and Union Minister Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi said that 'Commotion of Corruption' under the 'Carpet of Clan' is crystal clear. This has become 'Chaos of the Congress'. Arrogance of merchant of corruption proves that there is something fishy. Talking to reporters, Naqvi said that those who cannot differentiate between "burger and brinjal, onion and pizza, sugarcane and jaggery, grain and betel leaf, solar plant and solar park are giving statements full of ignorance on country's economy, security and reforms. They are trying to become political pantywaist in the pandemic period."

He said that India is the only democratic country in the world which, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, provided free food to 81 crore people, one nation one ration card, free gas cylinders to eight crore families, Garib Kalyan Package worth ₹1.70 lakh crore, ₹1,500 given into bank accounts of 20 crore women, ₹19,000 crore given under PM Kisan Samman Nidhi during the challenges of the pandemic. These steps instilled a sense of development with trust among the people of the country.

"During the Corona crisis, the Government brought historic and path breaking reforms in socio-economic-educational fields, administration, trade, labour, defence, coal, civil aviation, power distribution, space, forest land, agriculture, communication, banking and investment. These bold reforms have ensured that India has converted disaster into opportunity," added Naqvi.

Farsighted decisions taken by PM Modi has resulted into India being at a far better place in fight against Coronavirus in comparison to other developed nations. He has worked on the front line which has increased the country's trust on his leadership.

India is the largest producer of Jute and jute goods in the world, contributing about 60 per cent of the global production and providing livelihood to about five million people in farming and trade industry.

Although, the domestic market continues to be the mainstay for jute sector, of late, our export market share is also showing an increasing trend. India earns about ₹2200 crores per annum through jute goods export because of biodegradability and eco-friendly nature of this fibre. However, to be suitable for high valued diversified products, the quality of fibre needs further improvement. Besides the genetic background of the jute varieties, the quality of the fibre largely depends on retting process adopted by the farmers, said Dr Gouranga Kar, Director of ICAR-CRIJAF, Barrackore.

This year, initially, there was a setback in jute farming due to the outbreak of Coronavirus. Also Amphan cyclone wrecked a havoc on the crop in the third week of May. Despite COVID outbreak and the cyclone, there is a good standing crop because of the efforts of ICAR-CRIJAF and other stakeholders like National Jute Board, Jute Corporation of India, etc. Now that the harvesting and retting

have started, there is a need to adopt the technology of improved retting, so that best quality fibre is obtained.

In this context, Dr Kar mentioned that recently a breakthrough in jute retting research has been achieved by scientists of ICAR-CRIJAF who have decoded the genome sequences of jute-retting bacteria by high throughput genome sequencing. The in-depth genomic analysis significantly revealed three differ-

ent species of Bacillus constitute the consortium strains. Genome sequencing also confirms that retting bacteria degrades pectin, hemicellulose and other non-cellulosic materials, non-harmful for fibre. The bacterial strains are also non-toxic and thus the retting water with microbial strains can successfully be used for irrigation purpose. The sequence data has been submitted to the National Centre for Biotechnology Information

(NCBI) database of NIH, USA.

These retting bacteria were already incorporated in the microbial consortium, called "CRIJAF Sona" developed by ICAR-CRIJAF. Owing to its popularity, in last three years alone, 1428 MT of CRIJAF Sona worth ₹ 7.85 crore was sold to 3.6 lakh farmers covering more than 50,000 ha area in different jute growing states of the country.

While congratulating the team of scientists, Dr Gouranga expressed that such breakthrough is first of its kind in jute and is confident that these findings will help the scientists improve the microbial retting formulation for better efficiency and resilience. The genes for degrading pectin, hemicellulose and other non-cellulosic materials can be altered for enhanced retting efficiency and shortening the retting duration with minimal water usage. Thus, this breakthrough will facilitate to produce high quality jute fiber by farming community which will fetch higher income in the market.

The findings of the genome sequence research is recently published in journal Scientific Reports from the Nature Publishing group. Ref Datta, S. Saha, D Chattopadhyay and Majumdar B (2020).

The series also brings to fore the question of ownership of space on earth. The images of animals making their way

into urban spaces and reclaiming their freedom of movement, during the lockdown across the world, resonate with the resplendent wildlife on the different arks of life in the paintings. The cradle of mother nature that is present for all living forms had been usurped by civilisation and the spread of human settlements. In her paintings, Renuka makes us reflect hard on the outcome of our actions that had restricted animals to the sanctuaries or the zoo.

One of the paintings in the series sees the ark of life taking prominence as it occupies the centre of the canvas with fewer figures, but the perched panther ready to sprint, the innocent deer, and a girl with her back turned ready to step onto the life log. The artist peeping on the suspended log watches the girl begin her ascent. However, the most prominent object on the Ark is the green heart, literally with its aorta and vena cava, spelling the obvious that nature is the heart of the earth.

RETHINK, RELEARN, REDESIGN

The novel Coronavirus has badly affected people from all over the world. In February this year, the World Health Organisation (WHO) declared COVID-19 as a pandemic. According to WHO, pandemic is the advanced stage of disease progression. It means that a disease, after affecting the population of the country of its origin, has started spreading among other countries also. Presently, the pandemic has affected 217 countries and there is hardly any country left from this disease. America, European countries, Russia and china are the most developed countries, but none of them are out of the clasp of this deadly virus. Rather, even being most developed, these countries have tolerated the most devastating impact of the disease and could do nothing to check and control it.

Presently there is no medicine, vaccine or surgery available for COVID, only precautions and preventive measures can help. These measures have been devised by understanding the process of transmission of the virus. There are speculations that the virus has jumped from bats to humans. But then thereafter there is man to man communication only, which is easy and fast.

Anyone can catch the virus with contaminated hands. Major reason for the viral contamination of hands is direct recontact of the virus laden fluid droplets from a coughing or sneezing COVID infected person. Touching the Corona contaminated surfaces, where the virus laden fluid droplets have settled down may also be the reason for contamination of hands. So, maintenance of one meter distance, wearing mask and repeated hand sanitisation is must to remain protected from the virus. The incubation period to develop the disease is two days to two weeks (average six to seven days). Only after the incubation process, a Corona positive patient will show the symptoms. During this period, a Corona positive person showing no symptoms can share the virus. proper precautions is must.

Precautionary activities such as wearing mask and hand sanitisation are simple and easily executed. But maintaining distance is difficult as it is a social activity. When you are involved in social activities, you have lesser control on the situation. Moreover, it is challenging to maintain distance in the existing system and design of the world.

Scientists from all across the globe are struggling to invent the vaccine or medicine for the virus but so far there is no breakthrough. With each day, the situation is becoming terrible, uncertain and fearful. Man has struck to a catastrophic confusion, where on one hand, if he goes out for earn-



ing, his life is on stake because of possibilities of exposure. While, on the other, if he doesn't steps out to earn, his life is in danger again. So, the challenge is to protect the human life without involving people in economic activities, because without economic activities basic needs cannot be fulfilled.

Currently, there is no treatment available, so the only option is to learn how to live with the pandemic. This situation is not new for humans, rather, man is already living with different deadly diseases caused by the viruses and other micro-organisms. There is an urgent need to rethink, relearn, re-plan, redesign and rework about the personal, social, cultural, economic, educational, political, traveling, hospitality and other activities. It is important to have one meter distance among human beings, when they are at their home, workplace and public places. It is simple to suggest this but its execution and implementation will bring heavy expenditure of money, resources, effort, time and energy. World is already passing through the phase of severe economic crises and management, mobilisation and spending of such economic resources is not feasible. Creation of the desired new normal is very difficult. To address this challenge, researchers, academicians, industrialists, economists, businessmen, politicians, social-scientists and others should come forward to work together and evolve the policies, strategies, programmes and scheme.

Giroud helps Frank's side edge out Norwich & inch closer to top-four finish

Frank Lampard admitted Chelsea are struggling with nerves as they chase a place in the Champions League next season after Olivier Giroud scored the only goal in a 1-0 win over already relegated Norwich at Stamford Bridge on Tuesday.

Victory opens up a four-point lead for third-placed Chelsea over Leicester and Manchester United, who both have a game in hand later this week.

But Lampard knows there is still plenty of work to do with a trip to champions Liverpool and sixth-placed Wolves visiting Stamford Bridge on the last day of the season to come in Chelsea's final two league games of the season.

"I want more but that can wait. Where we are as a team and our position in the table, three points is everything," said Lampard.

"If we want to really move on then it can be better. It's not easy, there is a nervy feeling there for understandable reasons."

Lampard made five changes from the battering at Bramall

Lane with Giroud among those restored to the starting line-up.

Chelsea have already significantly bolstered their frontline for next season with the signings of Timo Werner and Hakim Ziyech.

But Giroud has more than justified the decision to also extend his contract by a year during football's shutdown as Chelsea's most potent striker since the restart.

"He's a big character for us and scoring important goals," added Lampard.

Giroud saw a number of

chances come and go in the first half as an attempted lob over Tim Krul fell gently into the Dutch keeper's arms before he sliced well over the bar when unmarked inside the area.

Christian Pulisic forced Krul into his best save of the first-half with a powerful drive that was just too close to the former Newcastle stopper.

Norwich's long-awaited fate of a return to the Championship was confirmed in a 4-0 thrashing at the hands of West Ham on Saturday.

There was more defiance from the Canaries in defence, but they failed to score for the seventh time in their last eight games to slump to a ninth straight defeat.

Daniel Farke's men failed to even test Chelsea goalkeeper Kepa Arrizabalaga or a defence that has been under the microscope for conceding 49 goals already in the league this season with a shot on target.

PL transfer window to run for 10 weeks

LONDON: Premier League clubs have agreed a 10-week summer transfer window, which will open on July 27.

Subject to the approval of football's world governing body FIFA, the window will open the day after the 2019/20 league season finishes and end on October 5, the date UEFA had recommended for the closure of registration periods across Europe.

The Premier League said that following consultation with the English Football

League, a domestic-only window will also be added from October 5 and close on October 16.

Transfers between Premier League clubs will not be able to occur during this period, but top-flight sides can trade with EFL clubs and loan or sign players permanently.

The EFL confirmed its window would open on the same day as the Premier League's but clubs would have an extra two weeks for domestic-only business. AFP

"Playing in the Champions League has helped us and made us grow," added Gasperini, whose side will play Paris Saint-Germain in the last eight next month.

"We are preparing for Paris Saint-Germain, but also want to fight to the end in Serie A."

"I think the best way to be ready for August 12 will be to play these last five league

Atalanta's top scorer Luis Muriel, with 17 league goals this season, watched from the stands but his absence was not felt with Croatian Pasalic opening the scoring within two minutes at the Gewiss Stadium connecting with a Ruslan Malinovskyi cross.

Brescia hit back minutes later with Ernesto Torregrossa pouncing on Atalanta defender Mattia Caldara's poor clearance.

Madrid get chance to clinch league title

The Spanish league trophy will be sitting by the field at the Alfredo Di Stefano Stadium on Thursday, with Real Madrid a win away from lifting it for the first time in three years.

Madrid will have its first chance to clinch the title when it hosts Villarreal at home following a long season that was in jeopardy because of the coronavirus pandemic.

It enters the second-to-last round with a four-point lead over Barcelona, which faces Osasuna at the Camp Nou at the same time.

Madrid needs two points from its last two matches to secure its 34th league title — and first since 2017. It can also lift the trophy with a loss if Barcelona fails to defeat Osasuna.

It would be Madrid's first league title since Cristiano Ronaldo left to join Juventus two seasons ago, and the first since coach Zinedine Zidane returned from a short break.

Barcelona won the last two league titles and was at the top this season when the coronavirus pandemic struck, but Madrid has been perfect since the break, winning nine straight.

"When we returned from the confinement after being

stuck at home for almost three months, I could see that the players wanted to achieve something big," Zidane said on Wednesday.

"I could see it during the training sessions, I could see it in how they were practising."

Madrid had lost three of its last four matches before the league was halted in March.

Barcelona seemed in control but endured an up-and-down run after the break, drawing three matches and losing its advantage at the top.

Coach Quique Setien, under pressure because of the team's results and lackluster performances, knows his club faces a tough task trying to overcome Madrid's advantage.

Barcelona has won eight of the last 11 league titles, with Madrid lifting the trophy in 2017 and 2012.

Madrid will face a Villarreal team that is sitting fifth in the standings and fighting for a Europa League berth.

It had one of the best runs following the coronavirus break, winning six of its nine matches.

"It will be one of our most difficult matches," Zidane said. "It's a very tough rival, a very good team."

Barcelona's opponent, Osasuna, is in 11th place.

4 games/day confirmed for 2022 World Cup

The 2022 World Cup will have four games every day in a 12-day group stage and matches later in the tournament that go into extra time will extend past midnight in Qatar.

FIFA released the schedule for the first World Cup to be played in November and December on Wednesday, with

kickoff times at 1 pm (1000 GMT), 4 pm (1300 GMT), 7 pm (1600 GMT) and 10 pm (1900 GMT).

Host Qatar will open the Middle East's first World Cup in the 60,000-capacity Al Bayt Stadium at 1 pm on

November 21. The final start at 6 pm on December 18 at the 80,000-capacity Lusail Stadium.

Eight venues in close proximity to Doha will be used at the tournament, which will be played in 28 days rather than the 32 days used at the last World Cup in Russia to minimize the disruption

to the European season. Teams and fans will not need to fly around Qatar because stadiums are within a 30-mile radius.

Both semifinals — like some games in the previous rounds — will kick off at 10 pm and will spill over into the next day if there is extra time, or even just long injury and VAR delays in regular time.
