## The Dharavi project

WHO has praised Asia's biggest slum for containing COV
through community engagement and fast protocols
 - Fom being a major cause for concern to being (WHO) for successfully containing the community spread of the Coronavirus, Asia's largest slum Dharavi, with a population density of 2.27 lakh per sq km, has come a long way. Along with taly, Spain and South Korea, Mumbai's slum cluster has shown that even if the outbreak is very intense and happens in an under-serviced and infrastructure-scarce settlement, it can still be brought back under control. All it needs is a synchronised human drill. Dharavi is indeed a test case of how resource-deprived zones can fight the virus, too. Its 6.5 lakh residents live in an area of just 2.5 km , which challenges the golden mantras for fignting the panderic, na. minimum of seven to eight people live together in small, 100 square feet dwellings and queue up for water each day as piped water at home is a luxury they can only dream of. A whopping 80 per cent of the slum-dwellers are forced to use community toilets and fresh air and good ventilation is a rarity as homes and factories co-exist in single buildings lining he slum's narrow lanes. Yet, on July 7 , the slum reported only one Coronavirus case and till July 10 , the number of cases was just 2,359 , a far cry from what was expected when the first case was discovered in Dharavi on Aprii 1 . In fact, Western Press editorials had written off Dharavi as a time bomb waiting to explode.
so what was it that the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) did to turn he tide of the pandemic? Because even as the rest of Mumbai suffered and became a hotspot, Dharavil defied all logic and did not turn into a Corona cesspool. The BMC decided to take the problem by its horns and involved the community in its chase of the virus. It set up teams to reach out to families and they reached out to almost seven lakh people in Dharavi, tracking signs and symptoms and tracing contacts of the infected. Between April 1 and July 10 , a whopping 47,500 households were scanned by doctors and private clinics. More than 3.6 lakh people were screened, out of which 14,970 people were screened in mobile vans, thus supplementing the work of overkey to containing any pandemic is rigorous testing, the BMC also ran fever clinics to let people get themselves checked without fear. Its teams also checked people's oxygen saturation levels and if they were below 95 per cent, they were taken to quaranine centres. The logic was that this was faster than testing and in any case it was not possible to test everyone. As it is, they were only able to test 13,500 people. The BMC also employed 350 local private practitioners and if someone was found to have symptoms, they could volunteer to be quarantined even without getting tested. Since home quarantine was never an option in Dharavi, Iocal clubs and schools were converted into quarantine facilities where free food and health check-ups were provided. As many as 2,000 elderly were taken to protective quarantine and only crivilily-11) patients were admitted to hospitals while 90 per cent patients were teated incle tie ai Hospital Prabhat Nussing Home and Family Care. A 200-bed hospital was also set up in a record 14 days. What Dharavi did was that it focussed on community engagement. Politicians and NGOs provided thousands of free meals and rations while Bollywood actors and businessmen donated gear, oxygen cyinders, gloves, masks, medicines and ventilators. Dharavi also followed the basic rules of testing, tracing, isolating and reating all those who were sick and hence, broke the chain of transmission and suppressed the virus. And to make sure that the lockdown worked, free meals and rations were provided to residents trapped at home without work and a source of income. It's not surprising then that Dharavi has turned out to be a beacon of hope for densepopulated cities in poor nations and Delhi and other cities struggling with the pandemic could well learn a lesson or two from it. Human endeavour is the biggest cure.

## Erdogan's revisionism <br> The world-famous Hagia Sophia museum in Istanbul, originally

药The Blue Mosque undoubtedly has its place in Istanbul but it is the Hagia Sophia which has the heart of every visitor. For rarely does one find such a secular icon in any world culture. Built as a cathedral, it has lasted since the 6th century through waves of conquests in Turkey, each era adding a layer of syncretism and a defining mark but never swamping its preceding legacy. So even though conquest in 1453, with domes on the outside, its insides were not defaced but just covered with lime wash and concealed. Just the practice of faith and its prayers changed. So Christian emblems, including the famous mosaic of the Virgin Mary on its central dome, were preserved through hundreds of years. And citizens internalised this co-existence as as being the progressive face al Atark, the rounlic one which would endure in the contemporary world. So he decreed that it should be a museum, where every faith symbol would be respected and kept the way it was, and welcome believers from everywhere. But according to a new decree by Turkish President Recep Erdogan, this all-faith shrine will revert to being a mosque as the courts annulled its museum staus following petitions by staunch Islamists.
By changing the status of Hagia Sophia, Erdogan is symbolically taking down Ataturk's inclusive and secular vision that had endeared Turkey to the world. To him, that amounts to pandering to the West. Yet that would have been the only antidote to the growing Islamophobia around the world. Powered by new-fangled radicalism, hyper-nationalism, immense nativism and a maximalist desire to lead a post-modern Islamic world, the Turkish leader has made Hagia Sophia's status a matter of Turkey's sovereignty. And a message for his core Islamist constituency that his leadership is worth its support. So though the move invited criticism from around the world, particularly the UNESCO, which said that the shrine was a part of shared world heritage and should not be appropriated by religiosity, Erdogan ordered the first prayers there and took down the site's social media handles. Of course, non-Muslim visitors would continue to be allowed in. Islamists have been campaigning for the reconversion of Hagia Sophia for long but a secular Opposition had been able to hold them off. But in a post-pandemic world, where Governments are justifying power grabs by all means, Erdogan has used this sensitive religious matter to justify his leadership, which is increasingly coming under criticism for mishandling the post-COVID economy and rising unemployment. And since Hagia Sophia was an Orthodox shrine once, his unilateral move has upset both Greece and Russia, both of which have sizeable Orthodox church followers. At a time when inter-faith dialogues have been replaced by collisions, Hagia Sophia has been a bridge in a deeply divided world. To challenge its status is to challenge civilisation itself. To define its identity sits at odds with a city that has bridged Europe with Asia. With this move, Erdogan has only stereotyped Islam further as revisionist and archaic. Hagia Sophia represented the dynamism he could have used to change the discourse and debunk myths. Perhaps even reclaim his ambition to craft a neoIslamic world. A secular icon strengthens faith, does not erode it.

FIRSTCOLUMN Rising fuel costs slow growth
Any society that pays high for its fuel suffers as this erodes incomes, reduces purchasing power and causes a slowdown in the pace of production

TWhe rising prices of food items are adding to the woes of the peo-
ple even as they struggle to come out of the economic impact ple even as they struggle to come out of the economic impac
the Coronavirus-necessitated lockdown has had on their lives and iveelinoods. Now that India has moved into a phased "unlocka quandary whether to allow full opening of their economies or continue as before with select sectors being allowed to open up. This uncertainty is dorts of suph ges in most entire globe. Job losses, reduction in income and fall in production are common. But in countries like India, the rising cost of transportation due to the unprecedented hike in administered petroleum/diese prices, is telling on the people. Given the reduced purchasing power,
inflation has added tothe woes of consumers and farmers alike. Despite higher minimum support prices, farmers have not been able to get even the minimum cost for their produce and have been forced to sell at rock-bottom prices.
Sckown the demand for, vegetrables processing plants remain under adirect bearing on most fagm produces. Corn for exampl tetched a direct bearing on most farm produces. Corn for example fetched fourth of that price. So a farmer who earned ₹20 plus lakh last year despite better production, is content with $₹ 5$ lakh this year. Plus, the arm sector is in trouble as input costs have increased manifold during the last few months. Even irrigating the fields costs more than people are certainly not beneficiaries of the crash in crude prices to around $\$ 40$ a barrel as the taxes have remained high. Any society that pays high fuel costs suffers in more than one way. It erodes incomes, reduces purchasing capacity and caus
at a time when pace in production is a must.
However, the rising food prices are in reality a pre-Corona pheConsumer Price Index (CPI) rose 14.2 per cent on an annual basis This was the highest increase since December 2013. The latest 20 to 40 per centr ise in prices of vegetables is attributed to higher labour costs and 15 to 20 per cent higher transportation costs. Supplies, 100, have reduced by about 15 per cent due to summer rains dam-
aging vegetable crops. The shortage of labour following the reverse migration has increased wages of farm labourers.
These all reflect in the spiralling vegetable and food grain prices.
Even prices of rice and wheat have increased in the market despite a massive dole being given to the poor by the Government. It is said hat in about 11 States, the free distribution of toodgrains has not data, 36 States and Union Teritories procured 6.38 lakh metric tonnes (MT) of eight lakh MT allocated for migrant workers by the Centre for the months of May and June. However, till June 30, just 1.07 lakh MT, about 13 per cent of the foodgrains was distributed. Andhra Pradesh, Goa, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Ladakh, Maharashtra, Meghalaya,

electricity and diesel prices. Overall, expelling and freight costs have increased. The Reserve Bank of India (RBII) in June noticed the inflaionary situation. Its Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) says, "The
macroeconomic impact of the pandemic is turning out to be more severe than initially anticipated because of supply disruptions and demand compression. Beyond the destruction of economic and financial activity, livelihood and heath are severely affected." The MPC says it is necessary to ease financial conditions further. It reduced
interest rates which caused hardships and further reduced purchasing power of the most vulnerable classes. There may not be any magic wand but a soft policy approach and reduction in Income-Tax rates rrices too can ill he common man. With a benevolent tax regime, to the well-being of the country.
