Farmers reject Shah offer, set talk terms

Farmers union threaten to block all entry points to Delhi, demand Cabinet Committee for talks; Shah assures high-level team of Ministers for dialogue if farmers shift to Burari

A day after Union Home Minister Amit Shah held out an olive branch to farmers protesting at Delhi's borders for four days against the new farm laws for talks anytime provided they move to the Burari ground, the farmers on Sunday rejected Shah's offer and said they will not accept any conditional dialogue and threat-ened to block all five entrypoints to the national Capital. The All India Kisan Sangharsh Coordination Committee (AIKSCC) on Sunday demanded the the Centre to name and authorise a Cabinet committee or a group

Sunday demanded the the Centre to name and authorise a Cabinet committee or a group of Ministers for future discussions with the farmers.

"The condition laid down by Home Minister Amit Shah is not acceptable to us. We will not hold any conditional talks. We reject the government's offer. The blockade will not end. We will block all five entry point to Delhi... The condition put for talks is an insult to farmers.

"We will never go to Burani. It is not a park but an open jail," Surjeet S Phul, Bhartiya Kisan Union's Punjab president, told reporters.

Addressing the nation through his monthly radio programme 'Mann Ki Baat', Modi touched on the varied issues including coronavirus pandemic and need to preserve cultural heritage.

Even as hundreds of farm-ers continue protest against the Centre's farm laws which have been described "anti-farmer". Prime Minister stressed that these farm laws had broken the shackles of various farmers and begun to lessen their problems. Giving example of one farmer Jitendra, he said the



farmer was not getting full-pay-ment of his produce sold and he made use of new farm laws to receive payment with the intervention of District Magistrate who, according to new farm laws, is mandated to solve payment problem within one month. "Don't be carried away by rumours, be aware", Modi said.

Panigrahi landed in trou-ble after the Tata Motors Limited (TML) recently lodged a complaint with the State Crime Branch police against Akash Pathak accusing him of committing cheating, forgery and impersonating as the man-aging director of the company. The company in its FIR mentioned that Akash had taken huge amounts of money fraudulently from unemployed youths alluring them of pro-viding jobs in the Tata Motors. Akash projected himself as the MD of Tata Motor Pune Passenger Division and CEO-

designate.

Interestingly, Panigrahi, in his reaction at a Press conference, advocated in favour of Abhay and Akash stating that the father-son duo is quite honest and are being framed with ulterior motive. His spirited defence of Abhay and Akash appeared to have justified his expulsion from the BID.

'Tiger State' MP loses 26 national animals in 2020

Madhya Pradesh, which is known as the "tiger State" of India, has lost 26 striped animals so far this year, as per the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA). Reacting to it, Madhya Pradesh Forest Minister Vijay Shah told PTI that the average death rate of tigers was less compared to their birth rate in the State in last six years.

According to the NTCA website, out of the 26 tiger deaths reported since, April

website, out of the 26 tiger deaths reported since April this year, MP lost 21 felines inside the tiger reserves, includ-ing 10 in the Bandhaygarh Tiger Reserve. No tiger death was reported in the first three months of this year, as per the data. In 2019, the State lost 28 tigers while three cases of seizures of body parts due to poaching were also reported. poaching reported.

Another fake ghee making unit busted

The Commissionerate Police on Sunday busted an adulterated ghee manufacturing unit at Sriram Bazaar are in Bayalis Mauja near Cuttack. The unit was busted following a raid conducted by a joint team of police and health officials after getting specific intelligence input. Logos of several ghee-manufacturing companies, raw materials and other equipment have been seized from the unit.

Senior officials informed

Senior officials informed that one person has been detained and he is being questioned in connection with the incident.

As per reports, the adulterated ghee was being sold to customers in packets and plastic jars having labels of different well-known brands.

A police officials said "The unit was operating since 2002. We have seized some seeds from the unit which was being used in the manufacturing of the ghee. We are verifying the documents and other licenses of the unit."

The police official further said that the unit was procuring palm oil which was used to prepare adultered ghee which

prepare adultered ghee which is not fit for human consump-tion. Moreover, the ghee pack-ets did not had manufacturing or expiry date on it.

After a series of three self-immolation attempts were made in a week in front of the State Legislative Assembly, the

The stretch of road between Jayadev Bhawan and the Rabindra Mandap in front of the Assembly was sealed restricting movement of vehicles would be allowed to move on the road when the Assembly would be in the session.

As per the decision, the commuters moving via Jayadev Vihar would be stopped at the office of Commissionerate police near 120 Battalion. Similarly, people commuting to AG Square from Acharya Vihar would be restricted at the Keshari Cinema Hall. The commuters coming on the route from AG Square from AG Square from AC Square from the route from AG Square would

be stopped at the Jayadev Bhawan.

Only the emergency services would be allowed to move on the route on showing the necessary documents, including the ID proof at the police check-post.

Notably, three suicide attempt incidents took place in front of the Assembly last week during its Winter Session, for

which the Commissionerate police considered to close the route completely to avoid any further untoward mishap.

The security personnel have kept vigil on movements of people, especially the pedestrians, on the roads near the Assembly to foil self-immolation attempts repeatedly being made in front of Assembly building.

It seems the Work Department's top mandarins have not bothered to learn any lesson from the Bomikhal flyover collapse, which, besides leading to loss of life and property, escalated the project cost due to the prolonging of the construction process.

The executing agency of the flyover, Panda Infra Private Limited which was later black-listed, was shown undue favour

Now, the Dillip Khatei Now, the Dillip Khater Constructions, which was involved in the construction the link building between the terminal-1 and II of the Biju Patnaik International Airport, which collapsed leading to the

death of a person, surprisingly is being shown undue favour by the department Secretary and the Chief Engineers and awarded a slew of projects.

This has raised many eyebrows because a high-level inquiry committee report blamed Dillip Khatei Constructions and questioned its expertise in undertaking such a prestigious project. The committee also accused the overconfident firm of ignoring the engineer's recommendation and poor construction work violating the norms.

Earlier, the firm was shunted out by private organisations for shoddy and poor quality construction. But despite it dubious track record, Dillip Construction has been awarded the Habisiali Building in Puri, which is a dream project of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik.

Family skips deceased's funeral for marrying Dalit

The deceased was identified as Ajay Palei (48), who was a CRC Cand the headmaster of Kandira Primary School.

About 14 years back, Ajay had fallen in love with a Dalit girl, who was a teacher in the locality. Later, they had tied

Into though the family members of Ajay were opposing the marriage. After the marriage, the family members of Ajay were separated from him. So, Ajay and his wife were staying in a rented house at Jall Chowk in the locality.

On Thursday Ajay had cardiac arrest and died at a Cuttack-based private hospital. His body reached on Friday night at his village. But ironically, when the Ajay's widow wife pleaded her in-laws to join the funeral, they strictly denied. As no relative or family memthe funeral, they strictly denied. As no relative or family members came to lift the bier, the body lay on the road for nearly five hours.

A harmonious coordination between legislature, executive and judiciary is one of the crucial aspects that concern governance. And incidentally, this has been the theme of a two-day 80th All India Presiding Officers' Conference in Gujarat and, most significantly, it was addressed by the

President, the Vice-President and the Prime Minister on such a crucial issue. Speaking on the concluding day, which also happened to be the 71st Constitution Day, Prime Minister Narendra Modi underlined the significance of "Maryada" or the limitations of each branch of the government or the separation of powers. He also spoke about the checks and balances inherent in the Constitutional scheme of governance, including the institutional course-correction mechanism in case of any eventuality of deviation from the ity of deviation from the Constitutionally-sanctioned

Constitutionally-sanctioned format.

According to the Prime Minister, there is a connection between the endeavour to harmonise the functioning of the three branches of the government and the "peoples trust". The Prime Minister seemed to

be insisting on "Jan Bhagidari" (people's participation) in gov-ernance through connecting them with Constitution, which them with Constitution, which they gave to themselves and making constitutional ethos and language more popular with the younger generation. On the other hand, President Ram Nath Kovind emphasised more on the role of the Opposition and the require-ment for deliberation with the ruling party. However, Vice-President Venkaiah Naidu was more attached to the theme and President Venkaiah Naidu was more attached to the theme and spoke of the "excesses" of the executive and legislature, according to him, the "violation of rights and liberties of citizens by the executive at times is too visible. At times, the legislature too has crossed the line ...", Besides, concerns were also expressed by the Vice-President about the increasing distur-bances of balance between the

various institutions under the

The Vice-President wa quite sceptical and critical about the judicial "overreach" and shrinking ground for the "jurisdictional sanctity enshrined in the Constitution" and also tended to beckon towards judicial interventions on matters ranging from fireworks on Diwali to denying the executive to playa role in judiworks on Diwalt to denying the executive to play a role in judicial appointments in the higher judiciary. Which, according to him, has led to "avoidable blurring of contours demarcated by the Constitution".

However, the concerns with some other quarters of this

democracy have been different from the concerns expressed by the Vice-President. Some of the views have been contrary to the government, like, it is actually the political executive which has been using its brute major; ty to get its way through many controversial issue, and that, the judiciary is not keeping up to the need of the hour to keep the balance between the three branches of the government and the monopolies in governance, basing upon the whims of the government. To put it in another way, there is no denying that there are instances of another way, there is no deny-ing that there are instances of judicial overreach or judicial activism but the discontent remains in the judiciary's unwillingness to be the con-science keeper of the executive and to remind it the limits of

its power.

There is no denying that, there is a need to introspect

about the disturbed constitu-tional balance but not essen-tially the way the Vice-President wanted it to be. It is

tially the way the Vice-President wanted it to be. It is important that the executive must self-aware itself about the fact that how much uncon-stitutional it is to use majority or majoritarian principle to suppress reasoned voices of the opposition and that it does more disservice than benefit to the nation.

It is also important that the executive should understand that the separation of power is important to be preserved as 'democracy' is such a 'magic wand' that, it can any moment lead to changing of sides, those constituting treasury benches may find themselves in oppo-sition in some point of time and vice-versa. And therefore, preserving separation of power shall benefit all, respecting dis-sent shall benefit and shall

secure greater national interest and collective good. The Doctrine of Separation of Powers was propounded by Montesquieu in 'De l'espirit des lois' although it was first proposed by John Locke to separate the legislative power into discontinuous legislative power and federative power. And in 'J87, the founding fathers of the United States of America took this principle into the frames of their constitution. Since Montesquieu believed in his theory that the same person should not form part of more than one of the three branches of the government.

And the Supreme Court of India has in cases like IR Coelhov. State of Tamil Nadu and Indira Gandhi v. Raj Narain has observed that the separation of powers was limited in the Indian context

unlike the United States. Irrespective of this, it is important to protect and preserve the kind of separation of power inherently designed within the Constitutional framework.

The separation of powers doctrine contemplates a system where powers are delegated by the Constitution to the three branches of the government and, thereby, exactly drawing the contours of the jurisdiction of each such branch along with reasonable grounds of trespass into each other's domain or ease of business and in greater national interest.

No worry for bread in lockdown

B'garh GP keeps 200 migrant returnees engaged

When during the Covid-19 pandemic, joblessness has hit millions, a panchayat in the distress migration-prone Gaisilet block in Bargarh district has done an exemplary work

Thanks to the effective implementation of various schemes, especially the NREGS, about 200 migrant workers who have returned to NRELS, about 200 migrant workers who have returned to their native villages from Mumbai, chennai and other places since the beginning of the year, were provided wage works.

These workers are no longer interested to migrate outside as their worry for bread is gone. Besides, they feel it great to be engaged in creation of assets for own villages.

According to sources, the Buremunda panchayat has undertaken a large number of

projects, other than digging earth or laying roads under the NREGS, to ensure the villagers get access to several amenities which are otherwise available in towns. Starting from RO drinking water project, mini stadium, children park to plantations and irrigation projects ducens of projects were undertaken during the lockdown period which not just gave the much needed financial relief to the poverty-stricken villagers who were struggling to make end meet after being laid off by their employers in other States, but led to creation of several assets.

assets.

Buremunda Sarpanch Saroj
Sribhusan Sahu who himself is Buremunda Sarpanch Saroj Sribbusan Sahu who himself is a post graduate in English lit-erature and who opted social service as mission of life rather than doing a high salaried job, said, " There are ample of opportunities to transform the lives of the rural poor and change the face of rural India. What is needed is will power and proper execution of sever-al schemes of the Government." Sahu said the Corona pan-demic was a challenge for him and he made it a point to

ensure that the migrant returnes in his panchayat were properly rehabilitated. "To achieve the mission, we initiated a host of programmes. We thought to create different amenities for urban centres. We have started a stadium urban centres. We have started a stadium at Zugim. The construction is underway. While the field has been levelled, cement benches have been constructed and may be been planted around the field. This apart, 700

saplings have been planted around the field. This apart, 700 coconut saplings have also been planted in bunds of two ponds at Baidapalli and Buremunda. This would not only keep the ponds safe, clean and beautiful but help the panchayat generate revenue within a few years after the coconut plants mature and bear fruits. Similarly, while three solar power run drinking water projects have been set up in the panchayat, we have also set up



an RO water project at Buremunda, narrated Sahu. He further maintained that the panchayat took up many other projects like improving the village Mahar Kata, construction of concrete canals to farm land, besides providing sewing, vegetable and mush room farming training. About 85 women have benefited from the training and are now earning on their own.

Notably, under the MGN-REGA, about 4, 64,426 work REGA, about 4, 64,426 work days have been created and 22,572 persons of 12,193 families have been engaged in Gaisilet Block in which the Buremunda Panchayat comes. 746 families engaged in different projects have completed 100 days work. Similarly, the NREGS workers were disbursed Rs 1.40 crore towards their wares.

In just three months after crossing the 20 lakh mark on August 7, India has added whooping 70 lakhs Covid-19 cases, taking the infection tally on early touch 94 lakh on Sunday while the number of people who have recuperated from the disease crossed 88 lakh pushing the national recovery rate to 93.71 per cent.

The total coronavirus cases mounted to 93,92,919 with 41,810 new infections being reported in a day, while the death toll climbed to 1,36,696 with 496 new fatalities, the data updated at 8 am showed.

The active Covid-19 case-load remained below 5 lakh for

the 19th consecutive day. There are 4,53,956 active coronavirus

the 19th consecutive day. There are 4,53,956 active coronavirus infections in the country which comprises 4.83 per cent of the total caseload.

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 88,02,267 pushing the national recovery rate to 93.71 per cent, while the Covid-19 case fatality rate stands at 1.46 per cent.

India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20-lakh mark on August 7, 30 lakh on August 23 and 40 lakh on September 18, 17 went past 50 lakh on September 128, 70 lakh on Cotober 11, crossed 80 lakh on September 128, 70 lakh on October 11, crossed 80 lakh on Cotober 29, and surpassed 90 lakh on Nowmber 20.

Mumbai along with chargesheet on October 9 and never took his police custody, the agency said. "All the necessary legal formalities such as his medical examination etc. were duly observed. Since then, accused Stan Swamy has been in judicial custody at Taloja Central Jail. Nearly after a month, i.e. on 6/11/2002, accused Stan Swamy filed an application in the NIA Court at Mumbai for getting back his straw and sipper, (which he falsely claimed to have been kept by NIA)," it said. The court asked the agency to file its reply on next date, which was scheduled on November 26.

The N1A filed its reply in the court on the scheduled date stating therein that it had conducted his personal search in presence of independent witnesses and no such straw and sipper were found.

It has also asked the colleges administration to take extra care of the anxiety, men-

extra care of the anxiety, men-tal health and psychological issues of students developed during the lockdown period and fear of infection after the

and fear of infection after the opening of the campuses.
The colleges have also been asked to set up helplines for mental health, psychological concerns and well-being of students in their campus which "need to be regularly monitored by Counsellors and

Institutions should have a plan ready for students who cannot join the programme due to travel restrictions. Online teaching-learning arrangements should also be made for them, it said.

Cultural activities, meeting etc. may be avoided. However, such extra-curricular control of the control

ing etc. may be avoided. However, such extra-curricular and sports activities may be allowed where physical distancing is feasible and is in accordance with the Union Home Ministry, it said.

All Students must bring all a RT-PCR report that is negrative at the time of re-joining the hostels and they must be re-called in batches. "However, the sharing of rooms may not be allowed in hostels. Symptomatic students should not be permitted to stay in the hostels under any circumstances," said the guidelines.

Also, noting that residential students may be coming from different locations, the guideline document said that "they shall remain in quarantine and self-monitor their they shall remain in quarantine and self-monitor their calls for a sper the policy opted by the State Government for quarantine (even if they bring a negative test report or the university/college plan to test them on arrival)."

Sweden acknowledges India's role as 'pharmacy of world'

Acknowledging India's role has the "pharmacy to the world", leading European nation Sweden said it is focusing on expanding bilateral cooperation in the areas of health and life sciences in view of the coronavirus pandemic. Swedish Ambassador Klas Molin also said Sweden and India stand "firmly and unequivocally" in the fight against terrorism even as he noted the growing Indian role in the Indo-Pacific region.

On the long-pending free-trade agreement between India and the European Union, the envoy said there is still some work to be done in calibrating expectations and scope on both sides, noting that it will be mutually beneficial for both sides.

Molin told PTI that over.

Molin told PTI that over-all bilateral ties between India and Sweden have been excel-lent and that both sides are looking at broader cooperation in eight key areas including innovation, trade and invest-ments, health and defence. "The pandemic has focused our thinking, and our cooperation in health and in

"India is the pharmacy to the world and some of our companies, some already established here, some of endergones of the presence of the presence

Under the law which deals with different categories of offences, a marriage will be declared 'null and void' if the conversion of a woman is solely for that purpose, and those wishing to change their religion after marriage need to apply to the district magistrate. The ordinance mainly envisages that no person shall convert, either directly or indirectly from one religion to another by use or practice of misrepresentation, force, undue influence, coercion, allurement or by any fraudulent means or by marriage nor shall any person abet, convince or conspire such conversion. The onus to prove that the

shall any person abet, convince or conspire such conversion.

The onus to prove that the conversion has not been done forcibly will lie on the person accused of the act and the convert, it said.

Baptism by fire As Uddhav Thackeray completes a year in office, the reluctant

politician seems to have mastered some rules of the game



obody had any expectations of Uddhav Thackerav. Not even as a descendant of Shiv Sena supremo Bal Thackeray, who always had a wish of one of his own becoming the Chief Minister. But Balasaheb had probably not bargained for the circumstances under which Uddhay became one. Or imagined him to stand out with quietude and resolve in a hostile environment of competitive politics. For years after tamely acquiescing to its bigger partner, the BJP, the Shiv Sena stood up to it following its improved performance in the Assembly elections last November and demanded chief ministership on that basis. The BJP, the single largest party, thought

it could rustle up the numbers to form its own Government and was surprised when Uddhav snapped ties with it, engineered a coalition with the opposition Nationalist Congress Party (NCP)-Congress combine and negotiated the chief ministership. A manoeuvre that was so not expected from a man who was hardly thought capable of the aggression of Thackeray senior. But one year down the line, he is on a steady course, walking with ideologically divergent partners, not overstepping the ego of the Maratha strongman and NCP chief Sharad Pawar, who is believed to have been the architect of the alliance based on a shared pursuit of power. Apart from a few creases here and there. Uddhay hasn't been an embarrassment for the Congress despite his avowed commitment to Hindutva causes and that party's to its minority plank. The BJP, not quite accustomed to the Sena's revolt yet, has expectedly been placing hurdles along the way of the coalition government, be it through gubernatorial interference, by thrusting Central probes or generally shaming Uddhav's lack guber hautanian menterine, by directions in Jeenia probes of general sharining obtained stack of administrative experience. As for the last, Uddhav had no time to settle in as the State recorded its first COVID-19 case on March 9, posing a severe challenge to the healthcare system. And before he could get a grip on it, Mahararshtra became the State with the high-est number of cases across India. Then the exodus of migrant labourers caught him by surprise, a fact played up by the BJP as an example of his ineptitude and lack of foresight. Still, Uddhav did not lose his cool and went in for aggressive containment measures, test-ing and medical protocols as Asia's biggest slum, Dharavi, put him on trial. Today, Mumbai is doing better than Delhi in handling the pandemic despite infrastructural weaknesses. Its caseload is going down, it is going for a graded reopening of sectors — unlike other States giving in to populist and commercial pressure — and is the first State in the country to have introduced international-style travel protocols to control the spiral of imported infection. The management of the Dharavi outbreak is a model example of how effective community engagement, awareness and deployment can tame the virus in resource-scarce and congested clusters. As the worst-hit State with a spiralling death count, Maharashtra seems to be finally getting there. And Uddhav, who may be borrowing lessons from the governance heft of the NCP-Congress, must be credited with having the will to deliver without drawing attention to himself. In fact, given his administrative inexperience, he has empow-ered efficient bureaucrats and shunted out the slackers, clearly emphasising that performance would be the only qualifier of assessment. The best part is he hasn't failed to call a spade a spade. He publicly admonished the police for indiscriminate use of force during the lockdown and in matters religious has taken an apolitical stand despite his Hindutva moorings. So when Maharashtra Governor B G Koshyari prodded him on opening temples, wondering if he was delaying because of his "secular" partners, Uddhav shot back, asking if Hindutva meant simply opening religious places and as someone who had sworn on the Constitution, was he denying the secularism enshrined in it? Besides, he managed the festival season with reason. By confining the Ganesh Mahotsay to a largely indoor celebration, he avoided a super spreader event. In an editorial in Saamna, he even questioned the utility of all shrines in a pandemic. At the same time, he calibrated his response to Muslims, considering the Sena's stand on the Babri masjid and the Ram temple. He used the Congress to urge the community not to congregate in mosques and stayed away from fanning the fire on the Tablighi Jamaat. In fact. Uddhay, in his own way is trying to posit raming ure nie of ure radingin admaat. In lad, Quotay, in its own way, is unjug to post his Hindutva as nationalism rather than the BJP kind of communalism so that he can jus-tify his togetherness with the NCP-Congress. And given the Sena's history of rowdyism,

he is trying to split his politics from bogeyism.

Uddhav's assets so far have been his straightforwardness and realism, which have held him in good stead. His respect for Pawar in keeping the coalition largely frictionless is the other reason for his stability. But he has to watch out against ambitious leaders who have already accused him of setting up a coterie to enable a smooth transition to his son Aaditya. And a jilted BJP with the means won't give up trying to break him and picking up dissenters. It almost had him on the lynching of sadhus in Palghar, who were mistaken by villagers for thieves and child lifters. Luckily for Uddhav, who was slow on the investigation, some BJP office-bearers were found to be among the lynch mob and spared him the criticism of running over another Hindu cause. Of course, the BJP baited him on the suicide of actor Sushant Singh Rajput, though the CBI ultimately ruled out a conspiracy. But going by the State Government's demolition drive at an actress' office or a journal ist's arrest, Uddhav must stop falling prey to the BJP's design of reactive politics. He certainly could have handled these cases better despite the provocation. If he is to last a full term, he needs equanimity. He doesn't need to flex muscles.

Bubble trouble

The problems with the Pakistani cricket team in NZ highlight the challenges of sequestering sportsmen



hile the Indian cricket team began its tour of Australia, not minus some controversy surrounding the fitness of Rohit Sharma, it had already spent a few weeks in quarantine without any issues. Not so for the Pakistani cricket team playing across the Tasman Sea. While every player carried a clean bill of health on leaving Pakistan, it is reported that seven cricketers have tested positive for the Coronavirus since they ved. This throws into doubt Pakistan's COVID-19 testing regime and with the players being a bit loose and fast regarding the quarantine. The New Zealand

cricket board issued the Pakistani team "a final warning" and if the latter is in contravention of the quarantine or if more players test positive, then it could be sent home without having played a single match.

This incident, rather a series of incidents, highlights the problems of athlete bubbles and indeed the "bubble" travel system anywhere. Even with vaccine development moving along at an unprecedented rate, it is still at least two years before a sub-stantial number of people worldwide can be inoculated. With the delayed Summer Olympics still on track and several other major international sports tournaments, such as the European Football championships, also due to be played, it is vital that national authorities and sports federations work out the kinks as quickly as possible. And that includes player behaviour. Athletes are almost always extremely social young men and women, so asking them to stay locked up for a period of up to two weeks requires immense self-determination that not all of them have. These are challenges that have to be met if we expect a completely normal sporting calendar for 2021 and if even-tually fans are to return in full numbers to stadia. And on that last point, there were several Indian supporters during the first One-Day International between Australia and India. Despite the stadium only being at half capacity, Indian fans were clearly ignoring social distancing protocols, which looked Covidiotic and callous on television.

It essentially means that if an eligible manufacturer produces and sell-deports eligible goods worth ₹100 crore, the Government will give him ₹5 crore (assuming five per cent incentive) as a reward/incentive because such sale/export of locally manufactured goods will create local jobs. The PLI will be available for Sale/export for the next five years in addition to the existing incentives. Now this is one of the concerns that remains for investors and would need to be addressed to make the scheme a success. As the PLI benefit has been assured only for five years, the investor has to assess the financial viability of the project beyond the PLI period. Once a manufacturing until has been set up with a lot of fixed investment, recovery may be difficult. So the five-year period has to be utilised to make life easy for all businesses and job creators. In other words, the "case of doing business" has to improve substantially.

The Government should not turn its back on them but be empathetic to their community that provides food security to the nation.

By rejecting the RCEP membership, we have given China a free hand to integrate its economy with Asian nations. Maybe India should look West now



The "Act East" policy, with a focus on an extended neighbour-hood in the Asia-Pacific Region, has been the cornerstone of londias diplomacy in the current decade. While it was original-yocnceived as an economic initiative, in recent years, it has gained political, strategic and cultural dimensions, including the establishment of institutional mechanisms for dialogue and cooperation, India has upgraded its relations to a strategic partnership with Indonesia, Vietnam, Malaysia, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Australia, Singapore and the Association of South East Asia Mations (ASEAM) and has, thus, forged close ties with all countries in the Asia-Pacific. Further, part from the ASEAM Regional Forum (ARF), it has been actively engaged in regional fora, such as the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC), Asia Cooperation Dialogue (ACD), Mekong-Ganga Cooperation (MCC) and the Indian-Ocean Rim Association (IORA). bogey at home has been put into practice to generate an anti-India public opinion. Repeated unprovoked ceasefire violations and attempts to push in terrorists have become a norm. Apart from attempts to distract public attention at home, these are also being used to keep Kashmir in the focus of the international community as a potential flashpoint.

Pakistaris nuclear blackmail has been exposed and is no longer being used as a threat by its deadership. So it has increased its dependence on terrorist activities in India and the 'Deep State' is involved in spreading its tentacles in other parts of the country apart from Kashmir. Unfortunately, the IB sector remains our weakness, which is being exploited by the enemy. Many questions need to be answered by the Border Security Force (BSF) which is responsible for guarding the IB. Why is it that the tunnels are detected only after infillration has taken place? Why is no action taken to pin responsibility for the lapses? Why are no proactive measures taken to prevent similar failures in the future? Is it lack of

resources, professionalism or sincerity?

The Government has spent crores of rupes to equij the BSF so that it can stop infiltration, including the Comprehensive integrated Boarder Management System (CIBMS) to overcome the difficulties of the terrain. Not very long ago BSF officers had displayed to the media a tractor modified for tunnel detection. There were also claims of importing tunnel detection requipment. What happened to all that and why is that equipment not being used?

The BSF has been provided with sismic sensors and any underground disturbance is meant to be picked up by them. Definitely, the digging of a 150 metre-long tunnel should have been picked up by these sensors but it wasn't. Are these sensors non-functional or have they not been sited and deployed tactically? Incidentally these tunnels serve a dual purpose and the BSF knows that apart from sneaking in errorists, these are also used for smuggling narcotics. Plus, what was the need to make the detection of the tunnel public? Rather it should have been picked on make the detection of the tunnel public? Rather it should have been boobytrapped and kept under surveillance. We have to accept that there are major chinks in our armour as far as guarding the IB sector is concerned and the enemy is exploiting these to its advantage.

Knowing the enemy's compulsion to keep Kashmir on the boil, strict measures need to be taken to prevent Islamabad from treating the IB sector as a preferred rout for infiltration. First and foremost, the BSF needs to reconsider its pattern of deploying in a single line without depth. For day patrolling, it needs to be provided with detection equipment.

liaisoning with neighbouring units to cover gaps. The fact that the terrorists rekede on foot for nine km undetected and thereafter boarded a truck on the NH and travelled up to Nagrota unchallenged is a matter of concern and exposes the gaps in the surveillance and vigilance of depth areas and the NH. Hence, armed highway patrols have to be activated. Mobile checkposts have to be established to avoid predictability. Cameras need to be installed 24x7. There is an urgent and inescapable need for full body scanners at select places on the NH.

There is a valuable asset of era-servicemen in these areas. A Border Defence the stable of the stable of the valuable asset of ex-servicemen. They should be deployed on either side of the NH, up to a depth of five-10 km, depending on the distance of the B from the NH. It will strengthen the hands of the local police.

Through the eyes of 'the other'

The term is used to define 'the self' in contrast. But 'self-Orientalism', ironically, looks towards assumed Western authority for validation

In philosophy and literary criticism, the term "the other" means an entity which is constructed to define self. According to J Miller in The Sage Encyclopaedia of Quantitative Research Methods, "the other" is the opposite of the self. Both are perceptions though, constructed by an individual, community or the State. For example, the Nazis in Germany perceived the Jews as being racially inferior compared to the pure Aryan races. So the "imperfect" Jews were constructed as "the other" to define the "perfectness" of the Aryans (white Germanic races). The self in this respect can be an individual or an ide-

ology belonging to a perceived social, religious or political whole that can only be defined in contrast to "the other" which is either explained as being inferior, different or even threatening to the whole. The nationalist idea which led to the creation of Pakistan was almost entirely based on this. Muslim nationalism in India could only be defined in contrast to Hindu majoritarianism, "the other," which was explained as being "culturally different" and politically threatening to the Muslim community of the region.

In the same way, Hindu nationalism cannot be defined without the construction of the Muslim community of the region.

construction of the Muslim other. The self in this context can only reassure and strengthen its perceived self-image by assuring the assumed dissim-ilarities of 'the other.' Scholars such as Edward Said and the post-modernist philosopher Michel Foucault severe-ly castigated the self as an agent of con-formity. To bolster the power and self-image of social and political conformi-ty (of an elite), it demonised non-con-formists as "the other." To Said, the act

of European colonialists of imagining the colonised native as an uncouth, entirely sensual and overtly emotionabeing was an act of enhancing the self-image of the superiority of the European self in contrast to the oriental other.

In his 1961 book, Madness and Civilisation, Foucault argues that the conventional ties of off the server as the conventional ties of off the server as the server as the conventional ties of off the server as the server

Civilisation, Foucault argues that the conventional idea of madness was a conventional idea of madness was a "social construct" imposed by a conformist elite upon those who refused to conform. Years late, Foucault went on to praise the 1979 Islamic Revolution in Iran by deriding Western powers for demonising Ayatollah Khomeini as 'the other.' According to the Lebanese author Kim Ghattas, in her book Black Wave, Foucault did not retract his support for Khomeini even when he established an authoritarian theocracy and ordered the execution of hundreds of Iranian men and women.

On the other hand, according to the critics of Edward Saids Orientalism, Said clubbed together a diverse array of colonised peoples of Africa and Asia

as a homogenous whole and then defined this abstract totality in contrast to a ruthles European colonial set-up. In other words, to define a perceived homogenous self, he created "the other" in the shape of a colonial European elite, which was dismissed, in a rather binary manner, as being an entirely evil entity. This is understood as "Occidentalism."

This can imply that "the other" is not always passive. But on occasions, rather ironically, it strikes back, not by overturning how it is being perceived and demonised by a conformist collective-self, but by actually becoming exactly that. Foucault praised Iran's revolution as a 'Spiritual' event which was not understood by the 'non-spiritual' West. He believed this was why the West was demonising Khomeini as being fanatical and mad.

Yet, in response, Khomeini intensified this image of him as a way to differentiate 'Islamic Iran' from the secular West. He moulded a collective Islamic self in Iran in contrast to a Western secular other. This often

leads to what is known as "self-Orientalism" or when "the other" begins to behave exactly how a collec-tive self portrays and perceives it as

begins to behave exactly how a collective self portrays and perceives it selfing.

The selfing and the selfing and the collective self and weave them into a gargerssive ideology against the collective self, or to own these labels and present them as being as superior as that to the collective self. Khomeini owned the label given to him by Western governments of being "a fanatic" and user to the collective self. Khomeini owned it to intimidate the West, and on the other hand, normalise it as an ethos in Iran. Muslim radicals around the world followed suit.

Things in this respect are even more intriguing in India. This ploy was good for business and public relations. But 'the other' was missing. This made Indians seem entirely passive

and, as the historian Markus Daechsel demonstrates in his book. The Urdu Middle-class Milleu in Mid-wentieth Century India, this image was problematic and too effeminate for Findiun antionalists, especially compared to the "masculinity" of some forms of Muslim nationalism.

Ironically, decades earlier, by creating a Hindu other to define his idea of Muslim nationalism, this is exactly what Jinnah was warning about. So, in a way, Hindu nationalists eventually decided to own and then flex the label that Jinnah gave them.

That of being hegemonic and a threat to India's Muslim community. Self-Orientalism is often used by Jourism industries to cater to the 'Orientalist' perceptions of the West. But even if some practitioners of Self-Orientalism pose as being anti-colo-

nial and authentic (as in being non-Western, or more spiritual), they are usually overtly conscious of how the West is perceiving them. During the 2013 elections in Pakistan, campaign commercials of linran Khanis Centre-Right party, the PTI, showed a Pakistani being gladly wekcomed by her minigration officer (in a blonde wig), presumably in a European country. Here the post-colonial self was seek-ing validation from a post-colonial Western other. Sometimes indigenous acts are performed just to gain traction from Westerners. In 2003, the former chief of Jamaati-Islami, the late Qazi Hussain Ahmad, said there was noth-ing wrong in behaving or looking reli-gious "because the West is more appreciative of this." This is an exam-ple of how self-Orientalism looks towards the West for validation. An image was adopted (of religiosity) to attract attention (and maybe praise) of "the others" by confirming to the per-ceptions of a "pious Musilim."

'Chinese activities along **Indian border provocative**'

An influential US lawmaker Ahas expressed concern over reports of China's continuing construction activities along the Indian border in Ladakh,

India and China have been locked in a military standoff, which began in May, along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh.

Armies of both countries have deployed a large number of troops along the LAC. Multiple rounds of talks between the two sides to resolve the standoff have not yielded any concrete outcome. "If if (reports) turns out to be true, it would be yet another provocative measure by the Chinese military to change the facts on the ground; and Krishnamoorthi told PTI.
"It would also fit the pattern of their conduct in the South Chinase military to change the facts as we previously understood them, and they would be deeply disturbing, to say the least, said Krishnamoorthi, who is the first-ever Indian-American to be on the US House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence.

chief, Zahir Shah Nikmal, also confirmed the death toll and casually figures from the attack. Afghanistan's Defense Ministry released a statement claiming 10 soldiers were killed and nine wounded. The ministry also offered a different account of what happened than the official at the National Security Council, saying the vehicle exploded near the army base after security forces opened fire on the car. It was not immediately clear why there was a discrepancy. Interior Ministry spokesman Tariq Arian said a suicide bombing took place, though he did not provide further details. The soldiers stationed at the base were responsible for conducting night raids, providing support to the army and police forces under siege, and taking part in large-scale operations against the Taliban and Islamic State group in eastern and southern provinces of Afghanistan.

New model to enable drug predictions against Covid-19

Researchers have developed a computational model of a human lung cell which has been used to understand how SARS-CoV-2, the virus behind Covid-pid disease, uses the host to survive, and to enable drug predictions for treating the virus. Using a computer model of a human lung cell metabolism, the study published in the journal Life Science Alliance, have captured the stoichiometric amino and nucleic acid requirements of SARS-CoV-2.

requirements of SARS-CoV-2 Their model has identified host-based metabolic pertur-bations inhibiting SARS-CoV- 2 reproduction, highlighting reactions in the central metab-olism, as well as amino acid and nucleotide biosyn-

thesis pathways.

In fact, researchers found that only a few of these metabolic perturbations are able to selectively inhibit virus reproduction.

able to selectively inhibit virus reproduction.

"We have created a stoichiometric biomass function for the Covid-19-causing SARS-CoV-2 virus and incorporated this into a human lung cell genome-scale metabolic model," said study author Orkun Soyer, from the University of Warwick in the UK.

Singapore woman who had **Covid gives birth to baby** with antibodies: Report

Singapore: A Singaporean woman, who was infected with the novel coronavirus in March when she was pregnant, has given birth to a baby with antibodies against the virus, offering a new clue as to whether the infection can be transferred from mother to child. The baby was born this month without Covid-19 but with the virus antibodies, the Straits Times newspaper reported on Sunday, citing the mother.

"My doctor suspects I have transferred my COVID-19 antibodies to him during my

pregnancy," Celine Ng-Chan told the paper.
Ng-Chan had been mildly ill from the disease and was discharged from hospital after two-and-a-half weeks, the Straits Times said. Ng-Chan and the National University Hospital (NUH), where she gave birth, did not immediately respond to a request for comment. The World Health Organisation says it is not yet known whether a pregnant woman with COVID-19 can pass the virus to her foctus or baby during pregnancy or delivery.

Dave Prowse, actor who played Darth Vader, dies at 85

Dave Prowse, the British weightlifter-turned-actor who was the body, though not the voice, of arch-villain Darth Vader in the original "Star Wars" trilogy, has died. He was 85. Prowse died Saturday after a short illness, his agent Thomas Bowington said on Sunday. Born in Bristol, southwest England, in 1935, Prowse was a three-time British weightlifting champion and represented England in weightlifting at the 1962 Commonwealth Games before breaking into movies with roles that emphasized his commanding size, including



Frankenstein's monster in a pair of Hammer Studios horror films. Director George Lucas saw Prowse in a small part in "A Clockwork Orange" and asked the 6-foot-6-inch (almost 2-

meter) actor to audition for the villainous Vader or the Wookie Chewbacca in "Star Wars." Prowse later told the BBC he chose Darth Vader because

"you always remember the bad guys." Physically, Prowse was perfect for the part. His lilting English West Country accent was considered less ideal, and his lines were dubbed by James Earl Jones. Prowse donned Darth Vader's black armor and helmet for "Star Wars" (1977), "The Empire Strikes Back" (1980) and "Return of the Jedi" (1983). He expressed some regret that, thanks to Vader's mask, TI can walk around with complete

that, thanks to Vader's mask, "II can walk around with complete anonymity,"
"All actors crave recognition and I'd like to have some like Luke Skywalker and Han Solo," he told The Associated

Press in 1980. "Fortune tends to follow fame." Prowse also worked as a trainer for other actors, helping

trainer for other actors, helping Christopher Reeve prepare to be the Man of Steel in hit 1978 film "Superman."

Prowse was also known to ageneration of British children as the Green Cross Code Man, a superhero in a series of road safety advertisements during the 1970s and '80s.

He was a regular at "Star Wars" fan events, but was banned from official conventions by Lucas in 2010 after the pair fell out.

Wars" films, tweeted that Prowse was "a kind man & much more than Darth Vader." much more than Darth Vader.

US second biggest FDI source for India during Apr-Sep 2020

New Delhi: The US has emerged as the second biggest source of foreign direct investment (FDI) into India, replacing Mauritius, during the first half of the current financial year, according to data of the commerce and industry ministry.

During April-September 2020, India attracted FDI worth USD 7.12 billion from the US and USD 2 billion from Mauritius, which slipped to fourth position, the DPIIT (Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade) data showed.

Mauritius was the second

Mauritius was the second biggest FDI source during the same period previous year.

The US was the fourth biggest investor during that period.

Singapore with USD 8.30 billion foreign inflows continued to be the top source of FDI for India in April-September

for India in April-September 2020-21.

The country has received USD 2.1 billion inflows from Cayman Isands.

The islands was followed by Netherlands (USD 1.5 billion), UK (USD 1.35 billion), France (USD 1.13 billion), Germany (USD 202 million), Germany (USD 202 million), According to experts, increasing FDI from the US reflects the further strengthening of economic ties between the two countries.

The US was also India's top trading partner in 2019-20.

"Though the Ministry of Commerce has taken some initiatives to impress upon them to conduct their business activities under the purview of the law but these e-commerce companies have been avoiding the law on one pretext or the other," CAIT said in the letter.

The traders' body while "urging for strong action against e-commerce companies" also requested that an e-commerce policy should be announced immediately with an explicit provision of empowered regulatory authority.

Resume REC trade soon, trading pause to impact discoms' ability to meet RPO targets: Power exchanges

Further suspension on trading of renewable energy certificates (RECs) would impact state power distribution utilities ability to meet renewable purchase obligation (RPO) targets, electricity exchanges PXII. and IEX said, stressing that the trade should be resumed at the earliest.

Talking to PTI, Indian Energy Exchange (IEX) Head and Senior Vice President - Business Development Rohit Bajaj said, "REC market is a key avenue for obligated entities

Bajaj said, "REC market is a key avenue for obligated entities such as captive power produc-ers, discoms and open access consumers to fulfil their RPO requirements.

"Owing to the pause in REC trade since the last five months (July 2020), and com-pliance year coming to an end in the next four months, any further delay in resuming the trade will greatly impact their ability to meet their RPO targets in a timely manner," he added.

With renewable energy With renewable energy taking a centre stage in India's energy future, such matters require expeditious resolution to keep the country on track to achieve its renewable targets, Bajaj said.

"We hope that honourable APTEL soon issues the final order so that the trading can commence in December," he added.

CII urges industry not to lower guard against Covid-19

New Delhi: Industry body CII has urged its member companies in north India to not lower guard against COVID-19 and ensure that the prescribed norms of wearing masks, maintaining physical distance of at least 6 feet and avoiding large gatherings are followed.

With COVID-19 cases rising for the past few weeks at an unprecedented rate, the pandenic continues to pose hardship for the entire country, the chamber said in a statement on Sunday.

Many states in northern India are experiencing probably the second or even the third wave of rise in infections and mortality. With the onset of winter, the problem is getting accentuated, especially for the vulnerable ones, it added.

demic fatigue is an expected and natural response to a prolonged public health crisis, the chamber said "we need to understand and keep in mind the repercussions of dropping our guard not only on the health and safety of those around us but also its impact on our work and everyday lives".

FinMin asks PSU general insurers to cut flab; |Cos raise ₹25,000 cr via IPOs | rationalise branches, other expenses: Sources

New Delhi: The Finance Ministry has asked public sector general insurance firms, especially National Insurance, Oriental Insurance, to rationalise branches and cut down avoidable expenses to improve their financial health, sources said.

Earlier this year, the Union Cabinet decided to halt the merger process of three state-owned general insurance companies due to weak financial positions of these three companies. Instead, the government approved fund infusion of \$12,450 crore to meet regulatory parameters.

The finance ministry has The finance ministry nas asked these companies to cut the flab by rationalising branches and rein in other avoidable expenses like guest houses, etc, sources said.

Besides, sources said, they have been asked to expand their business through digital medi-

provision of ₹6,950 crore for capital infusion in these three insurance companies in order to maintain the requisite minimum solvency

As part of capital infusion As part of capital infusion exercise, the government also approved raising authorised share capital of National Insurance Company Ltd (NICL) and Oriental Insurance Company Ltd (UICL) and Oriental Insurance Company Ltd (UICL) and Company Ltd (UICL) to ₹5,000 crore each. The ₹12,450 crore capital infusion approved by the Cabinet in July includes ₹2,500 crore provided to these companies during 2019-20.

During this year, the Government infused ₹3,475 crore while announcing infusion of the balance ₹ 6,475 crore in

one or more tranches.

The government in Budget 2020-21 had made a provision of ₹ 6,950 crore for capital infusion in these three insurance companies in 1 nies in order to maintain the re uisite minimum solvency

uisite minimum sorrency, ratio.

Three PSU general insurers, with their large underwriting losses of ₹14,443 crore, together have been responsible for the overall losses of over ₹7,118

NICL, with a combined ratio of 160.8 per cent and under-writing losses of ₹5,759 crore, has suffered losses of ₹4,108 crore while OICL (141 per cent, ₹4,197 crore) and UIIL (132 per cent, ₹4,497 crore) have been hit with losses of ₹1,524 crore and ₹1,486 crore, respectively in 2019-20.

New Dehi: High liquidity and robust interest from investors helped companies raise nearly ₹25,000 crore through initial share-sales this year so far and 2021 is expected to be equally strong for the IPO market, companies from diverse sectors like pharma, telecommunication, IT and financial services have made their way to the IPO space during the period under review.

According to an analysis of data available with the stock exchanges, 12 initial public offerings (IPOs) in 2020 so far raised around₹25,000 crore, significantly higher than ₹ 12,362 crore mopped up through 16 initial share-sales in the entire 2019.

Prior to that, 24 companies had floated their IPOs in 2018 that raised ₹30,950 crore.

In 2020 so far, close to ₹25,000 crore has already been raised through IPOs and the figure could rise further as Burger Kings Re 810-crore initial share-sale is schedule to open on December 2.

Vinod Nair, head of research at Geojit Fina Services, attributed higher fund raising in this year pared to 2019 to high interest of corporates and investors for the primary market despite huge contrain the economy.

"These registrations granted on deemed basis require verifications to ascertain that they have genuine business or intends to carry out so," the CBIC said while issuing Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for carrying out physical verification of persons who

During the physical verification, the officer, among other things, would verify that in case the applicant intends to carry out manufacturing activity, the capital goods, if required for the said manufacturing activity, have been installed.

Abstract artist WASSILY KANDINSKY's works revolved around Russian folklore and culture. portraying his belief in art's ability to transform the self and society. By UMA NAIR

The newly-opened Guggenheim Museum Bilboa in New York is now home to a stellar exhibition by abstractionist Wassily Wassily with Kandinsky. The most enchanting works here are his early woodcuts. Scholars say that before he abandoned the figurative idiom, Kandinsky created evocative works on paper, largely in black and white.

A very few people are aware that
Kandinsky had traded a very promising
career in law for a position of an art
director at a printing firm in Moscow.
The next year he came to Munich, cargring with him the knowledge of classic printmaking techniques like woodcut, etching and lithography.
The woodcut, in particular, challenged the artist to reduce compositions
and narratives to simplified, expressionist forms, often using just black ink or
limited palettes.

In 1907, Kandinsky produced
numerous original woodcuts featuring
women in traditional Russian costumes,
embodying, the romantic, fairytale

women in traditional Russian costumes, embodying the romantic, fairytale imagery he favoured early in his career. Among them, Birches (Schalmei), Women in the Woods (Frauen im Wald), Two Birds (Zwei Vogel), and Church (Kirche) — as well as another woodcut, Horsemen — were reissued as photogravures with the title, Xylographies, in the Parisian magazine, Les Tendances Nouvelles in 1909.

The title, 'Church,' draws attention to the pervasive musical elements of the portfolio. Kandinsky's fascination with the emotional power of music inspired his later abstract compositions, and was a lifelong interest for the artist. In this woodcut, we see a composition that blends the architectural setting of a church with an onion-shaped dome with two women in the foreground. However, when the women are standing on each side — left and right — and both are lost in their own contemplation. The details and elements of the children, the sky and the street — all become a part of a panoram-

ments of the children, the sky and the street—all become a part of a panoramic spread that juxtaposes each detail and anchors them with a singularity.
Scholars say that in this series of woodcuts, Kandinsky prepared one block for the artwork's lines and another with its coloured areas, pressed both not the same paper, and then handpainted the resulting image through watercolour. Kandinsky's lifeliong and passionate interest in music was a great inspiration to his later abstract period. Although these works seem traditional to the contemporary audience, the Antiough these works seem tautholiat to the contemporary audience, the reduction of forms was an important step forward for his early career. Kandinsky's woodcuts are experi-



mental in technique but fully assured and

mental in technique but fully assured and characterised by juxtapositions and combinations of events. The woodcuts ranged in style from Kandinsky's early dirytale kidom to fully-fleedged abstracts of great power and beauty.

For him, 1907 became an important year. He produced a body of woodcuts that was published as Xylographies in 1909 in the Parisian periodical, Les Tendances Nouvelles. In the works, we see a current of nostalgia for traditional Russian folklore and culture — horion-shaped domes of Church, the costumes of the women and an ambient sense of fullness. se of fullness

Hence, Church is an important woodcut in the lifeworks of Kandinsky as it reveals how his Russian roots continued to move and inspire him. He

For Kandinsky, even the most abstract forms retained expressive, emotive content. For instance, the triangles embodied active and aggressive feelings; the squares denoted peace and calm; and the circles represented the spiritual and the cosmic realms. As a pioneer of abstraction and a renowned aesthetic theorist, he is among the foremost artistic innovators of the early 20th century. In his endeavour to free painting from its ties to the natural world, Kandinsky swork was based on an artist's "inner necessity".

In Munich, in the 1900s and the early 1910s, he began exploring the expressive possibilities of colour and composition but he was forced to abruptly leave Germany with the onset of World War I in 1914. The artist eventually returned to his native place, Moscow, where his pictorial vacabulary started to reflect the utopian experiments of the Russian avant-garde. He emphasised geometric shapes in an effort to establish a universal aesthetic language.

establish a universal aesthetic language.
Kandinsky subsequently joined the faculty of the Bauhaus, a Germachool of art and applied design, that shared his belief in art's ability to transform the self and the society. Compelled to abandon Germany again when the Bauhaus closed under Nazi pressure in 1933, he settled outside Paris, where surrealism and the natural sciences influenced his biomorphic imagery. This exhibition extols his brilliance both as an artist and as a thinker. and as a thinker.



India saw a sharp escalation in the cases of violence against women during the lockdown. RAMA SHARMA reports that the situation is worse in remote areas as women neither have information regarding their rights nor have access to necessary resources

ast week on November 25, people from across the world protested of violence and abuse against women on International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women. In the context of the ongoing pandemic, a United Nations report suggests that all types of violence against women and girts, particularly domestic, has intensified. Several women's rights organisations across the world are demanding their respective governments to take effective measures to safeguard young girls and women caught in the cycle of violence. Considered to be the 'Shadow Pandemic', growing amid the COVID-19 crisis, the UN has stated that to stop the same, global collective efforts are needed. "As COVID-19 cases continue to strain health services, essential services such as domestic violence shelters

The pandemic has forced people to spend more time with themselves than ever. Along the way, it has reshaped and broadened the way many think about and prioritise how they treat themselves — what has come to be called self-care.

The pandemic-era incarnation of self-care isn't about buying a signature outfit, wearing a trendy shade of lipstick or getting a perfect haircut. It has, for many, but the purpose and meaning of

and helplines have reached capacity. More needs to be done to prioritise addressing violence against women in COVID-19 response and recovery efforts," highlighted the report published by the UN.

India, which reported a 7.3 per cent increase in rape cases from 2018 to 2019 as per the National Crimes Record Bureau, saw sharp escalation in incidences of violence against women during the nationwide lockdown implemented to contain the spread of virus. As per different news reports, the National Commission of Women (NCW) received 13,410 complaints of crimes against women between March-September 2020, of which 4,350 were domestic violence. Complaints peaked in the March-May period with 1/3rd of them being filed in these three months

alone. The situation was worse in rural and remote areas. From Rajasthank Chaksu municipality, located 40 klolmetres from Jaipur district, many women shared their ordeals with the writer confirming the statistics. "My husband has posed his own lockdown on us. He doesn't allow either me or our children to step out of the house and fights if we ask him for financial support. He is strictly against the idea of letting me work outside the house, shared Sujata Sharma. Seenwati Swami, another woman from Tonk district, shared how her husband indulges into physical violence under the influence of alcohol and wouldn't allow her to speak to amyone.

Rajasthan reported a surge of over 100 per cent in crime cases against women in May as compared to the

beginning of the year when the average jump was around 25 per cent. The total number of cases registered under various categories of crime against women in April were 879 which increased to 1,960 in May this year.

A 40-year-old woman, who got stuck for 30-days in Sawai Madhopur district during the lockdown, decided to walk her way to return to Jaipur. En route, she entered Barrakhandi village and stayed at a government school-turned-quarantine centre by the local head constable, where she was later gang raped by three men who were the residents of a nearby village.

"It is beyond my comprehension as to why the administration allowed a woman to be alone in an isolated quarantine facility. Despite increased presence of police everywhere during the lockdown, the crimes against women increased rapidly," rued Manisha Kukkar who is associated with a non-government women's organization in Rajasthan.

As per Kavita Srivastav, a social activist working in Rajasthan, cases that are reported to police or to women commissions represent only the tip of the iceberg. There are several cases which go unreported, especially from remote areas where women neither have information regarding heir rights nor have access to the resources. "As civil society organisations, we have collectively organisation many campaigns to end seculal and physical violence against women in the state. To achieve this, the role of police and administration is crucial," said Kavita.

Besides concerned authorities, many non-profit organisations had intervened in the situation by providing online

Besides concerned authorities, many non-profit organisations had intervened in the situation by providing online counselling to women impacted by the situation. However, women who have absolutely no information about how to access such platforms remain invisible and vulnerable. The systemic violence against women that is promoted by the basic structure of our patriarchal society is the main reason why violence against women increases even in situations which require humans to be extra sensitive. Blaming it on alcohol, household chores and other reasons is one thing but addressing the root cause of the problem is the need of the hour. The ongoing '16 Days of Activism' against Gender-Based Violence (GVB) campaign, which is part of the International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women and will end on December 10, is exactly an opportunity to rethink our strategies and actions for a more equitable future.



the series at Mount Maunganui tne series at Mount Maunganui with a game to spare, after win-ning the opening match on Friday by five wickets, as Phillips provided a batting mas-terclass.

Called up to the T20 side while regular skipper Kane Williamson focuses on the upcoming Tests, Phillips plundered eight sixes and 10 fours on his way to 108 as New Zealand posted a mammoth USA/3 and then restricted the West Indies to 166/9.

"You never know when the next opportunity is going to come and 1 came into this going let's go in as hard as 1 possibly can. I know I can do it," Phillips said.

The 23-year-old, who was born in South Africa but moved to New Zealand at the age of five, took just 46 deliveries to reach his century, the 10th fastest in T20Is and one ball faster than the previous New Zealand

T20Is and one ball faster than the previous New Zealand the previous New Zealand record held by Colin Munro. New Zealand stand-in skip-per Tim Southee alled Phillipss performance "incredible", adding that his two catches, one diving at full-stretch on the boundary, and the sharp run out showed "he's got that X-factor about him".

But while Phillips, along with Devon Conway who produced an unbeaten 85, put the game firmly in New Zealands hands, opposing captain Pollard was left fuming.

game hrmly in New Zealands hands, opposing captain Pollard was left fuming. After winning the toss and sending New Zealand into bat under overcast skies, Pollard believed the West Indies were in control when the Black Caps reached the halfway mark at 84/2.

"But between overs 10 to 15 "But between overs 10 to 15 we sort of lost it there," Pollard said. "In terms of the energy and feel and erraticness in the field, that's not the standard that we want to set for ourselves, and not the standard anyone wants to see in international cricket.
