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## China sharpens hacking in disguise

Beijing targets computer networks of countries to attack economies; using Tibetans, Uyghurs to evade scrutiny

China has undertaken a major exercise to use Tibetans and Uyghurs of mixed parentage for carrying out cyber-attacks worldwide, targeting computer networks of countries and acquiring their data in order to hit their economies.

The move, according to experts, comes as Chinese telecom companies, especially those related to 5G technology, are increasingly being under scrutiny of various Governments and Beijing's credibility taking a hit due to its suspected role in suppressing information on the origin and spread of Covid-19 in Wuhan, potentially hitting its business prospects.

Amid the expanding Chinese footprint through mega infrastructure projects under the Belt and Road Initiative, Beijing has already put in place an Internet which is parallel to the Internet led by the US dubbed as Digital Silk Road to exploit the same for advancing its strategic and economic agenda, the experts said.

China has been organising the China Skills Competition or the Tibet Autonomous Region Cyber Security Skills Competition in collaboration with the telecommunication firms and engineering/hardware companies and academic institutions to scout talent from the Tibetan and Uyghur communities with mixed parentage to evade scrutiny of

the law enforcement agencies in the targeted countries.

While such a Tibetan has been arrested in the US, the setting up of a Software Park in Gilgit-Baltistan region in Pakistan Occupied Kashmir has emerged as a major concern for India, they said.

Earlier this week, Pakistan Army Chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa visited Skardu to assess the latest situation and operational preparedness of Force Command Northern Areas (FCNA) troops deployed along the Line of Control (LoC) and later inaugurated a state-of-the-art Software Technology

Park in Gilgit. The Software Technology Park is an initiative of the Special Communication Organisation (SCO) backed by China to carry out cyber-attacks and compromise computer networks in the region. The Park will also seek to gather intelligence to secure the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor through data mining and modulating narratives based on such inputs.

India could also be vulnerable to such sophisticated attacks in the cyberspace as major technological upgrades in the telecommunication sector and Information technol-

## Don't recognise Ladakh, reiterates China

A day after Defence Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated 44 permanent bridges in border areas, China on Tuesday said "it does not recognise the Ladakh Union Territory illegally set up by India" and opposes infrastructure building in the region. It also claimed infrastructure development is the "root cause for tension" between the two countries.

The sharp reaction from Beijing came as eight of 44 bridges are in Ladakh where a stand-off is on between the armies of the two countries for the last five months. Successive rounds of military and diplomatic level talks between the

two sides have so far failed to break the logjam.

The seventh round of Corps Commander level talks were held on Monday in which both the countries reiterated their resolve to continue the process of dialogue to disengage and de-escalation. The parleys lasted for more than 11 hours in Chushul on the Indian side of the Line of Actual Control (LAC).

Issuing a joint statement on the talks, the two countries said on Tuesday the "two sides had a sincere, in-depth and constructive exchange of views on disengagement along the LAC in the Western Sector of India-

China border areas."

They were of the view that these discussions were positive, constructive and had enhanced understanding of each other's positions. Both sides agreed to maintain dialogue and communication through military and diplomatic channels, and arrive at a mutually acceptable solution for disengagement as early as possible.

Both sides agreed to earnestly implement the important understandings reached by the leaders of the two countries, not to turn differences into disputes, and jointly safeguard peace and tranquility in the border areas.

Incidentally, this is the second time the two armies came out with a joint statement. In the first such communiqué after the sixth round of military level talks on September 21, both the countries agreed to refrain from sending more troops to the border and maintain peace.

Against this backdrop when the process of talks is on in the right earnest, Zhao Lijian, spokesman for China's Foreign Ministry, on Tuesday while blaming infrastructure projects for tension, said neither country should take action that might escalate tensions. This is the second time in the

past few weeks when China has raised questions about Ladakh.

## 3 Covid re-infection cases, ICMR studying

Patients showed more severe symptoms in second re-infection, says studies; 24 cases in world

The Government on Tuesday said there are three novel coronavirus re-infection cases — two in Mumbai and one in Ahmedabad — identified in the country which are being studied by the Indian Medical Research Council (ICMR), a research wing of the Union Health Ministry.

Re-infection cases are those cases where people contract the deadly virus for the second time after being cured. This means that even people who have had Covid-19 earlier need to take the same precautions as everyone else. Some studies said patients showed more severe symptoms in the second re-infection.

The premier health research agency ICMR DG Dr Balram Bhargava at a Press briefing here pointed out that such cases of re-infection of the virus were a few, one in Ahmedabad and two in

Mumbai.

"As per World Health Organisation (WHO) data, there are about 24 re-infection cases in the world. The criteria to identify a re-infection case is somewhere between 90 and

100 days. The WHO has not yet decided the number of days. However, we're taking cut-off of about 100 days," said Dr Bhargava.

His comments came days after Union Health Minister Dr

Harsh Vardhan said, "Though there are sporadic reports of re-infection surfacing in various States, careful analysis of ICMR database reveals that many of these cases have actually been misclassified as re-infections."

## Uddhav, Guv slug it out in 'secular' duel

An ugly war of words broke out between Maharashtra Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari and Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray on Tuesday over the re-opening of places of worship which were closed down in the wake of Covid-19-triggered lockdown imposed in the State in March this year.

A day ahead of the BJP's proposed launch of a State-wide agitation for reopening of temples in the State, the Governor had on Monday written a letter — which smacked of political overtones — to the Chief Minister, questioning the latter's Hindutva credentials and wondering if Uddhav was receiving any "divine premonition" to keep postponing the re-opening of the places of worship time and again or whether he suddenly turned "secular".

Uddhav, who normally is not agitated over the criticism directed at him or his Government, hit back at Koshyari on Tuesday with vehemence, saying that he did not need any certificate for his

being practitioner of Hindutva



from the Governor and asking the latter if the latter meant "merely opening of temple means Hindutva and not opening means secular".

In a related development, an understandably upset NCP chief Sharad Pawar, whose party is one of the three constituents in the MVA Government in the State, shot off a letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, throwing his weight behind the Chief Minister, questioning the contents of the letter written by Koshyari to the Chief Minister and the "intemperate" language in it, saying that the Governor's letter to the Chief Minister "invokes the connotation as if it is written to the leader of a political party".

Koshyari — whose conduct had come in for severe flak in November last year after the hasty manner in which he had sworn in the BJP's Devendra Fadnis as the Chief Minister of Maharashtra apparently at the behest of the ruling party at the Centre — appeared to exceeded his brief as the Governor, if one were go by the contents of his letter to the Chief Minister.

In his letter, Koshyari wrote to Uddhav: "You have been a strong votary of Hindutva, you

had publicly espoused your devotion for lord Rama by visiting Ayodhya after taking charge as CM, you had visited the Vitthal Rukmini Mandir, Pandharpur and performed the puja on Ashadhi Ekadishi...I wonder if you are receiving any divine premonition to keep postponing the re-opening of places of worship time and again or have you suddenly turned 'secular' yourselves (sic), the term you hated?"

Taking offence to the Governor's invocation of the words "Hindutva" and "secular", Uddhav shot back in his reply: "True. I practise Hindutva. But, I do not require a certificate from you. Nor do I require such certificates from anyone. The act of according rousing welcome to a person who termed my State or my State capital as Pak-Occupied Kashmir (POK) does not fit into my concept of Hindutva". Through this statement, Uddhav was apparently taking a potshot at Koshyari for meeting actress Kangana Ranaut after her controversial com-

ment of comparing Mumbai to POK.

On Koshyari's comment if Uddhav was receiving any "divine premonition" to keep postponing the reopening of the place of worship time and again and his sarcastic poser to him if he had suddenly turned secular, Uddhav was emphatic when he wrote: "Why this question has come to your mind. Do you feel that merely opening a temple means Hindutva and not opening means secular? As Governor you took oath of office and secrecy as per the provisions of the Constitution, which is based on secularism. Do you agree with that secularism?"

Uddhav went into add: "You have asked me if I am receiving any divine premonition. You must have personal experience of divine premonition, I have absolutely no idea, I am not that big. I am studying what's happening in other States and trying to implement what is better for Maharashtra".

## Mehbooba released from PSA detention

On April 7, 2020 she was shifted to her own house but was barred from speaking to media and meeting others, including her party leaders.

Spokesman of Jammu & Kashmir Government Rohit Kansal announced the decision. He wrote, "Mehbooba Mufti being released today." Mehbooba's daughter Iltija Mufti also tweeted instantly confirming the news.

## CBI visits crime spot in Hathras

Victim's brother asked to identify the place, cops told to cordon off area

A CBI team on Tuesday visited the crime spot in Hathras where a 19-year-old Dalit woman was allegedly gangraped on September 14 and later succumbed to the physical assault.

After reaching the area, the agency team called the victim's brother to identify the place and directed the local police to cordon off the crime scene. The move comes nearly a month after the woman was allegedly raped and assaulted by four men of the village.

A team of forensic experts from the Central Forensic

Science Laboratory (CFSL) is expected to carry out a detailed crime scene recreation soon, officials said.

The victim had succumbed to her injuries at a hospital here on September 29 following which the District Magistrate reportedly ordered cremation of the body against the wishes of the family in the dead of the night which aggravated the furor over the crime incident and the handling of the issue by the local administration.

The Uttar Pradesh Government referred the case to the CBI for investigation. The protests snowballed into a political storm with Congress, Aam Admi Party, Trinamool Congress and other Opposition leaders of the State from the Samajwadi Party and Rashtriya Lok Dal staging massive protests.

## Farm experts praise Centre for laws to free farmers from clutches

At a time when Opposition parties and a section of farmers have opposed the farm Bills, experts and academicians associated with farm sectors have praised the Modi Government for bringing the new legislations saying they will benefit the farmers as well as industries in future.

Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, along with Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar, met policy experts, industry leaders and academicians associated with the agriculture sector and they were all praise for the new legislation. In a separate meeting, Union Housing and Urban Affairs Minister Hardeep Singh Puri also reached out to scientists, professors and senior professionals from the farm sector in Congress-ruled Punjab to clear misgivings about new

farm laws.

The Modi Government has assigned several Ministers to meet farmers' organisations and others associated with agriculture to dispel their apprehensions. In Punjab, the BJP's ally SAD, which left the Government in protest against the farm laws, has been agitating while farmers' organisations have blocked railway tracks since September 24.

After his interaction with Singh and Tomar, chairman of Global Food and Retail Council Rakesh Gambhir said it was a good discussion and praised the Government. "In a way these three farm Bills will usher a new era of reforms in the agriculture sector and will give farmers' independence from the clutches of the middle men and help in getting them better prices for their produce," Gambhir told reporters.

# UP government issues guidelines for opening of cinema halls

The Uttar Pradesh government on Tuesday issued guidelines for reopening of cinema halls and multiplexes from October 15 with 50 per cent capacity and air-conditioners working between 24 and 30 degree Celsius.

Issuing the guidelines, Chief Secretary RK Tiwari said that all cinema halls and multiplexes are bound to follow the Standard Operating Procedures

(SOPs) in letter and in spirit. In case of violation, action would be taken against the guilty, he said.

As per the guidelines, cinemas, theatres and multiplexes will be allowed to open from October 15, almost seven months since lockdown was imposed. Auditoriums, however, will be allowed to operate with only 50 per cent capacity.

Under the SOPs, adequate physical distancing is mandatory inside cinema halls which

means that every alternate seat will have to be kept vacant and clearly marked. Moreover, cinemas will also have to provide provisions for sanitisers and hand washing facilities.

Use of the Aarogya Setu app is encouraged and all cinema-goers will be thermally screened before entry. Only asymptomatic individuals will be allowed to enter, Chief Secretary said while issuing the guidelines.

“Adequate social distancing



norms will have to be followed in the waiting areas too. People waiting for the show will have to maintain a distance of

six feet,” he said.

While box office counters will continue to remain open, the government has encour-

aged online bookings as far as possible. Box office counters, the guidelines say, will remain open throughout the day and advance booking will be allowed so as to avoid crowding.

Further, floor markers will be placed to guide physical distancing as well as for queue management.

Cinema-goers have been advised to avoid moving during intermission and, as per the guidelines, no delivery of food

and beverages will be allowed inside the auditorium.

Only packaged food and beverages will be sold and the number of food counters will be increased so as to prevent long queues.

Chief Secretary said that cinema halls will now have staggered show timings so as to prevent a large gathering outside the auditoriums before a film begins. “The box office and other areas will also need to be regularly sanitised. Inside

the auditoriums, the temperature setting of all air conditioners will be between 24-30 degrees Celsius,” the SOP said.

Public service announcements on wearing masks, physical distancing and hand hygiene will be made before and after the screening as well as during the intermission. The viewers may also be required to provide their phone number at the cinema hall in order to aid in contact tracing should the need arise.

## Atrocities against dalits continue

Reports of atrocities continued to pour in from across the state on Tuesday with a minor committing suicide following rape in Chitrakoot, three sisters suffering injuries after acid was thrown on them in Banda while in Lalitpur an old man was forced to consume urine.

According to reports from Chitrakoot, a minor Dalit girl was allegedly sexually assaulted by the three men in Kotwali area and on Tuesday the victim committed suicide at her house. According to the victim's family, the girl had gone to the fields to relieve herself in Kaumraha Ka Purva village on October 8 when the three men abducted her.

“My daughter was taken away on a motorcycle by three men on October 8 who sexually assaulted her. Few hours later, we found our daughter lying in a nursery with her hands and legs tied. We tried to know the name of the culprits but she did not respond as she was traumatised by the incident,” the mother of the victim said.

The woman said they informed the police about the incident but her daughter did not even respond to police queries owing to the trauma. However, the girl was found dead in her house on Tuesday.

“The girl hanged herself in her house.

We are investigating the matter,” Assistant Superintendent of Police Chitrakoot, Prakash Swarup Pandey, said. The body of the victim has been sent for postmortem examination, he added.

In another shocking incident, three minor Dalit sisters received burn injuries when an unidentified attacker threw acid on them in Paska village in Gonda district in the wee hours of Tuesday. Two of the girls received minor burn injuries while the third was injured in the face. Kajal (17), Mahima (12) and Sonam (8) were sleeping on the roof of their house when they were attacked by an unidentified person. No arrest has been made so far. The victims were admitted in a district hospital for treatment. The village comes under the Paraspur police circle jurisdiction.

The girls' father Ram Avatar maintained that he had enmity with no one and was clueless about the motive behind the crime. Gonda Superintendent of Police Shailesh Kumar Pandey said that police were questioning the girls and police teams set up to track down the culprit.

The initial probe revealed that the girls were sleeping in a room on the second floor of the house and the attacker climbed up to throw acid from the open window. The cops said the sequence of events suggested that the attacker was aware about

the family and knew that the girl slept in a room on the second floor.

The eldest girl, the officer added, would probably help in tracing the accused and clarify the reason behind the attack.

In another inhuman act, a 65-year-old man was allegedly assaulted and forced to drink urine in Roda locality of Lalitpur. A few days ago, the accused had attacked the elderly man's son with an axe, following which, the father-son duo had lodged a complaint against him. The accused, identified as Sonu Yadav, was irked by the victim's actions and had been forcing them to withdraw the complaint.

On Tuesday, Yadav allegedly forced the Dalit man to drink urine. Identified as Amar, the victim alleged that the accused assaulted him with a stick when he resisted. “When I refused, he attacked me with a stick,” he revealed, adding that he had attacked his son with an axe a few days ago and we they complained against him to the police so he was forcing them to make a compromise.

Lalitpur SP Mirza Manzar Beg said that the accused are among influential people in Roda village. He said that the police registered an FIR promptly and arrested the prime accused. Beg added that efforts to arrest the remaining accused were underway.

On the energy sector, the minister said that there was a 6 per cent drop in demand globally, hence, it was important for all to address this globally as well.

“Some countries have better technologies and innovative systems for renewable energy. For countries that haven't developed at that scale, we can join hands happily,” he added.

Singh added, “Renewable energy (RE) is an important factor and the state government is working towards 20GW of RE. While many big players have joined hands but there is still huge scope for others under Open Access System policy.”

## Cong announces candidate for Malhani bypoll

**Lucknow (PNS):** Earleir announcing six candidates for the imminent Assembly bypolls, the Congress declared its candidate for Malhani seat of Jaunpur. Bypolls are scheduled at seven Assembly segments in Uttar Pradesh on November 3.

State Congress spokesman Brijendra Singh told news persons in Lucknow on Tuesday that party chief Sonia Gandhi after consultations with UP leaders decided to field Rakesh Mishta in the Malhani seat.

The Congress had earlier fielded Dr Kamlesh Singh from Naugawan Sadat (Amroha), Sushil Chaudhary from Bulandshahr Sadar, Sneha Lata from Tundla (SC) in Ferozabad, Kripa Shanker from Ghatampur (SC) in Kanpur Dehat, Mukund Bhaskar Mani Tripathi from Deoria and Aarti Bajpai from Bangarmau (Unnao).

## Services of two policemen terminated in Mahoba

**Mahoba (PTI):** The services of two absconding policemen, including an SHO, were terminated Tuesday after the SIT, probing the death of a stone trader due to gun shot wounds in Mahoba district last month, found them guilty in the case, a senior UP police official said.

Indrakant Tripathi, 44, died after accusing the district's suspended SP Manilal Patidar of demanding a bribe to allow the transportation of ballast. Tripathi was found injured in his car with gun-shot wounds on September 8, days after he levelled allegations of corruption against Patidar, and died on September 13. His brother has alleged that Patidar had demanded a bribe of Rs 6 lakh from Tripathi and threatened to kill him or send him to jail in case of non-payment within a week.

The SIT, however, has concluded that Tripathi died by suicide. Its probe found the bullet was fired from Tripathi's licensed pistol from the front and it pierced through his neck and got entangled in the car seat behind, police said.

On September 9, Patidar was suspended with immediate effect on corruption charges and a vigilance probe was ordered into his wealth.

On Tuesday, Chitrakoot-Banda range IG K Satyanarain told reporters that the services of Kabrai police station SHO Devendra Shukla and constable Arun Kumar Yadav have been terminated.

## Late MP's 'Rasam Pagdi' irks Muslim clerics, family trashes objections

Normally associated with Hindus, a 'Rasam Pagdi' function organised by late MP Rasheed Masood's family amid chanting of Vedic mantras at his native Bilaspur village of Saharanpur on Sunday, has irked Muslim hardliners.

The 'Pagdi' ceremony is held days after the death of the family's eldest member to choose his successor. The next surviving elder wears the 'Pagdi' — a symbol of honour. The former Union Minister's son Shazan Masood was appointed as head of the family during the function.

Masood passed away after being infected by Covid 19 at a Roorkee hospital on October 5. A video of the event that soon went viral on social media also invited sharp reactions.

Deobandi Muslims clerics who attended the function, not only left the venue as the rituals began but also demanded the late MP's family members to 'seek apology from Allah' (tauba) for indulging in an unIslamic

act.

“The 'Pagdi' ceremony was done as per Hindu rituals and some seers present there chanted Vedic mantras. Tying Pagri and choosing an elder in the family is a good tradition but it should have been done as per Islamic tradition,” Maulana Asad Qasmi said on Tuesday.

Reacting to the criticism, the late MP's son Shazan said, “My family is not affected by the reaction of clerics as it has been a tradition for ages. Similar functions were organised for my grandfather and uncle by their Hindu friends. My father's entire life was devoted to Hindu-Muslim unity and we respect people's sentiments who wanted to pay tribute to him through the ceremony. Nobody should object to it as Islam respects all faiths.”

Congress leader and late MP's nephew, Imran Masood also trashed the clerics' objection. “This is not a new thing. This is their way of paying respect to departed soul. What is wrong in this? Who are they to come between us and God?”, he asked.

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# CM for caution as officials warn of second wave

Expressing satisfaction over 44 per cent decrease in the active number of Covid-19 cases in the state, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has directed officials to remain cautious and alert.

“The unlock will further be increased in future and other activities will also be started gradually. Public address systems and other means of communication should be used to spread awareness continuously about safety and security from the virus,” the CM said while presiding over a high-level unlock review meeting at Lok Bhawan on Tuesday. He said people should be inspired and motivated to follow Covid-19 protocols.

Meanwhile, as Uttar Pradesh recorded 3,033 fresh Covid cases hinting that the state is marching on the recovery path, officials have sounded a warning that any laxity could lead to a second wave, as seen in some states and several foreign countries.

“There should be no laxity by people and Health department in prevention of coronavirus infection as there are reports of a second wave in a couple of states,” Additional Chief Secretary

(Health) Amit Mohan Prasad said on Tuesday.

He said that during the past 26 days, the state has witnessed a decline of 44 per cent in cases after witnessing the peak on September 17.

He said 3,033 fresh cases were reported and 3,662 patients recovered on Tuesday. The recovery percentage in the state has also increased to 89.92 per cent. At least 6,466 people lost their lives with 26 fresh fatalities in the last 24 hours.

Directing the officials to monitor the recovery rate in all the districts, the CM said the recovery rate of Lucknow should be improved further. To ensure this, an effective strategy should be formulated and testing be increased in the district, he said, adding that the treatment facilities at SGPGI, KGMU and RMLIMS should be strengthened further.

The CM also asked the Additional Chief Secretary (Health) to ensure increase in recovery rates in Ayodhya, Varanasi and Sitapur.

He said active participation of all sections of the society should be ensured in the ‘Mission Shakti’ campaign that focuses on safety and security of women and will

start from Shardiya Navratra.

Similar programmes related to security of women should also be organised in business organisations and MSMEs, he said. Directing to officials to effectively publish the programmes held under ‘Mission Shakti’, the CM said stickers should be pasted and a helpline number be released.

The CM said appointment letters would be given away to over 31,000 assistant teachers appointed by the department of Basic Education on October 16 and ‘Mission Shakti’ would begin from October 17.

The CM directed the officials to organise programmes in all the districts on both the dates and invite the in-charge ministers along with people’s representatives. He said all the departments related to women security programmes should submit the work plan by Tuesday itself.

Directing the officials to engage people’s representatives in the ongoing cleanliness and sanitation campaigns in the state, the CM said works related to cleanliness and sanitation should be carried out in urban and rural localities. The activities carried out during the campaign should also be publicised widely, he added.

# Recovery rate in dist improves to 91.4 pc

The recovery rate in Lucknow has improved to 91.4 per cent and the total number of people who have defeated Covid-19 at the moment is 53,554. A senior official at the CMO office said the reason for improvement in recovery rate is that the number of severe cases in the recent past has been less. Lucknow is one of the best districts in the state in terms of recovery rate, he pointed out. The official said that from September 15 onwards, 853 teams have carried out surveillance in Lucknow, covered 7,96,198 houses and screened 35,97,000 patients. “There are repetitions in the screening figures since surveillance teams have visited houses more than once,” the official said.

He further pointed out that they were increasing the testing and antigen testing was helpful because the results can be had in a short duration. “RT-PCR is used for symptomatic people only while antigen testing for asymptomatic ones. In the current scenario, the percentage ratio of RT-PCR to antigen testing in the district is 55:45,” he said.

A drive was carried out by the Health

department in which all the dialysis units of hospitals were visited by the Additional CMO and his team. The visit was made to see if the hospitals had effective preventive measures in place and if the staffers were aware enough to go for an immediate test in case of symptoms.

“We observed that when patients come for dialysis, they test positive for coronavirus because some in-house circulations are being carried out in the dialysis units,” he said. Two of the hospitals which were not following the norms were warned. Regarding the district administration having already released the guidelines for re-opening of schools and cinema halls, the official said: “We are planning to take the samples of all the staffers at cinema halls and multiplexes. A medical mobile unit will go to all these cinema halls in the next 2-3 days and carry out antigen testing and RT-PCR to prevent the spread of infection,” he said.

He added that managements of schools had been provided detailed guidelines. “These guidelines state that there will be no intervals and symptomatic students have to be managed by the staff nurses and proper screening needs to be carried,” he added.

# Decline continues as 270 test positive

The downward spiral continued with only 270 persons testing positive for coronavirus across the state capital while 494 patients recovering on Tuesday. The number of recoveries reached 52,947. Lucknow has witnessed 790 deaths so far while there are 4,593 active cases.

A senior official at the CMO office said the patients included 32 from Gomtinagar, 26 from Indiranagar, 23 from Chowk, 22 from Rae Bareilly road, 16 from Cantt, 14 each from Talkatora, Hazratganj & Aliganj, 11 each from Madaion & Alambagh and 10 from Hasanganj.

As many as 10 patients died in Lucknow and the deceased included four from the state capital while the rest from other districts such as Kanpur, Basti, Siddharthnagar, Amethi, Jaunpur and Azamgarh. A 30-year-old man from Lakhimpur Kheri died due to Covid-19 at KGMU on Tuesday.

Across the state, 3,033 per-

sons tested positive, including 266 in Varanasi, 183 in Moradabad and 148 in Prayagraj, taking the total number of cases to 4,42,118.

There were 29 deaths in the state, including three in Ayodhya, two each in Varanasi & Sitapur, and one each in Kanpur, Gorakhpur, Meerut, Moradabad, Barabanki, Maharajganj, Etawah, Basti, Unnao, Farrukhabad, Kannauj, Auraiyya and Sambhal, taking the toll to 6,466.

Besides, 3,662 patients recovered, taking the number of recoveries across the state to 3,97,570 while there are 38,082 active cases in Uttar Pradesh.

# Woman attempts self-immolation at BJP office gate

Piqued by torture allegedly at the hands of her in-laws, a 35-year-old woman of Maharajganj attempted to immolate herself just outside the office of Bharatiya Janata Party in Hazratganj on Tuesday afternoon. She suffered severe burns and was rushed to a hospital where her condition was said to be critical.

As per reports, Anjali Tiwari was married to a Maharajganj native but the couple settled for a divorce as they had quite a lot of differences. She later came close to a person, identified as Asif Raza and in due course of time, both got married. After a few months, Asif left for Saudi Arabia for work while Anjali stayed back with her in-laws.

She was tortured allegedly by her in-laws even as Asif chose to look the other way.

According to a complaint letter recovered her bag, she was living in a rented house after separation from her first husband and later met Asif Raza who introduced himself as Raj. It was stated that she got pregnant while living with Asif. When Asif came to know

she was expecting, he force-fed her some medicine due to which she suffered abortion. She stated that she was married to Raj in the presence of a ‘maulvi’ and later started living in a house in Mohaddipur and Padri Bazaar in Gorakhpur. She also wrote that her name was changed to Aisha Begum. Police said they were verifying the authentici-

ty of the letter.

Commissioner of Police Sujit Pandey said Anjali got down from an e-rickshaw at Capital trisection and reached gate number 2 of BJP office.

“She set herself on fire in a jiffy. Policemen, including a sub-inspector, somehow doused the flames and rushed her to a hospital,” he said.

Pandey said huge force

was deployed at the area and the woman did not reach near Lok Bhawan. “Anjali was married to a man of Maharajganj but the couple went for divorce. She wanted to live with Asif Raza but as he left for a foreign country leaving her behind, she attempted to end her life. The case is under investigation,” he said.

The incident exposed

Lucknow police’s preparedness in preventing self-immolation attempts on Vidhan Sabha road and near Lok Bhawan. Recently, the police presence was increased on the road stretch between Capital trisection and Babu Bhawan crossing following an incident in which a woman of Rae Bareilly and her daughter had attempted self-immolation a few months back.

In the incident, the woman had died while her daughter recuperated at Civil hospital. The police had booked several persons, including a Congress leader, for allegedly inciting the woman and her daughter to take the extreme step. The woman and her daughter were being harassed by some influential people of their village and the Rae Bareilly police were not helping them. The government had taken a serious note of the incident and asked the Lucknow police to prevent a repeat of such incidents. Police presence was increased on the road stretch and sleuths of local intelligence unit were also asked to keep a close watch on movement of protesters and others.

# Woman’s body found in canal

**Lucknow (PNS):** Semi-clad body of an unidentified woman was recovered from Indira canal in Chinhat on Tuesday. Some villagers spotted the body in the canal on Tuesday morning. A police team reached the scene and the body was fished out from the canal. The identity of the deceased could not be ascertained.

Police said the deceased appeared to be aged around 35 years and the body was 20-25 days old. The police said the body flowed from elsewhere. Villagers could not identify the body. A team of forensic scientists also reached the scene to collect evidence. The police suspected that either the woman committed suicide or she was thrown into the canal.

Meanwhile, a group of men thrashed their rival in Chinhat on Tuesday, leaving him injured. The complainant, Monu Mishra of Uttardhauna village in Chinhat, is a native of Bahraich. He was returning home after purchasing goods from Tiwariganj. When he reached near his house, his rivals — Ram Gopal, Ram Teerath, Munaur, Abhishek and others — attacked him with sticks.

# KGMU OPD services to resume on Oct 19

KGMU OPD services will resume from October 19. Spokesperson Dr Sudhir Singh said that to protect health professionals and workers, OPD attendance will be limited and there will be a pattern of online registration like SGPGI

“Patients must get themselves registered online and no patient will be allowed to enter into OPD premises without prior online registration. Online appointments can be made either through www.ors.gov.in or by calling on 0522-2258880 which will be having 30 parallel lines,” Dr Singh said.

He said patients must come only on appointed date and time along with prior appointment proof. “Without mask, no patient or attendant will be allowed entry. A patient along with only one attendant will be allowed on priority if they have recent or not more than 3-day-old RT-PCR negative report from a government institution. Those without a recent RT-PCR report will be screened,” he said. Cardiology OPD will run in new OPD block, Orthopaedic, Paediatric Orthopaedic, Sports Medicine, Rheumatology and Physical Medicine OPD will be in the old OPD block. Obstetric and Gynaecology, CTVS, Psychiatry and Respiratory Medicine OPD will run at their respective departments. Geriatric mental health will run in the Psychiatry department.

# Govt official found dead in duct at OCR building

A 51-year-old government official working as an arrangement officer (vyavastha adhikari) at Old Councillors’ Residence (OCR) building in Hussainganj, who was missing for the last three days, was found dead and the body was recovered from a duct on the second floor on Tuesday.

Police said the official fell in the duct made in the multi-storey building for ventilation and died. The body was sent for autopsy and further investigation was underway. His kin accused police of being apathetic as he remained untraceable for three days.

The deceased was identified as Naeem Akhtar who lived in flat number 1103 on 11th floor in B-block of OCR building.

As per reports, Akhtar left his flat around midnight on October 10 but did not return. His wife Sulagna lodged a case at Hussainganj police station but the cops did not visit the flat for investigation.

On Tuesday, some inmates on the second floor felt putrid



smell and they informed officials looking after arrangements in the building.

Hussainganj SHO said Akhtar fell down in the duct and died later. “The body was found entangled in the wires protruding in the duct. We have sent the body for autopsy and further investigation is underway,” he said.

Sources said the police were obtaining Akhtar’s call detail records to find out the names of those who contacted Akhtar on the fateful day.

The ACP said Akhtar committed suicide due to family issues. “He had shared the issue with some of his family members and wished death upon him,” the ACP said.

# 5,21,652 flats under PMAY ready for sale

**Lucknow (PNS):** UP Housing and Development Board has constructed over five lakh flats under the Prime Minister Awas Yojana (PMAY) across the state. According to an official communiqué, 5,21,652 flats are ready for sale across the state while 9,47,523 are still under construction.

# 115 COVID-19 patients found

PIONEER NEWS SERVICE ■ VARANASI

As many as 115 new COVID-19 patients have been tested positive in the district here on Tuesday, increasing the total number of cases to 15,276. Besides, the day also saw one more death, increasing the toll to 247. During the day, the follow-up negative reports included 161 patients. Out of them, 158 were recovered from home isolation, increasing the number to 11,027 while three have been discharged from the hospitals and the number of cured patients from the hospitals has reached 2,769. The total number of patients who have been recovered so far is 13,796, leaving 1,233 active patients. The recovery rate has slightly

improved to 90.31 per cent and the mortality rate to 1.61 per cent. Meanwhile, Chief Medical Officer (CMO) Dr VB Singh has informed that in the first report of the day by 11 am, 93 positive patients were detected out of 3,325 received reports. Till then, the total test reports received were 2,58,924 and the results of 1,454 are awaited. Out of them, 2,43,670 were negative while 15,254 positive. The total number of samples collected was 2,74,796. Earlier, a male aged 50 from Sindhora succumbed to COVID-19 at Sir Sundarlal Hospital (SSH), Banaras Hindu University (BHU). With the addition of eight new red zones, the total

number of hotspots has increased to 2,183 including 298 red zones. There are 1,885 green zones with 17 new ones. Earlier, under ongoing mass/group antigen tests, six persons out of 310 tests were detected positive at Shree Shiv Prasad Gupta (SSPG) Hospital, Kabirchaura, while one out of 265 at adjacent Government Women's Hospital, two out of 55 at CHC Shivpur, three out of 45 at Swami Vivekanand Government Hospital, Bhelupur, three out of 125 at LBS Hospital, Ramnagar and five out of 368 at SSH BHU. Besides, the Health department has distributed 5,192 Ivermectin tablets to 649 persons. So far, 10.57 lakh tablets

were distributed to 1.32 lakh persons and out of them, 8.66 lakh tablets to 1.08 lakh persons were distributed only by the Health department while rest of tablets by other departments including Supply and Education departments and Civil Defence so far. In this belt of Purvanchal (eastern UP) comprising 10 districts of three divisions, as many as 386 new cases were found on Monday, increasing the total number to 49,463, with maximum 198 COVID-19 positive in Varanasi followed by 36 in Jaunpur, 29 in Azamgarh, 28 in Chandauli, 27 each in Sonbhadra and Ghazipur, 14 in Ballia, 12 in Mau, nine in Mirzapur and six in Bhadohi.

# ₹ 30 cr for promoting fisheries: DC

Divisional Commissioner (DC) Deepak Agrawal said that for promoting fisheries in the division, ₹ 30 crore grant has been received and a Mandi (market) would be set up at Chandauli. He was reviewing progress made in various development works at a meeting of officers here on Tuesday. In his address, the DC emphasised on increasing the income of the farmers and other producers, highlighting the various types of facilities being given by the Central Government under its economic package which have included opening of APEDA (Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority) office, pack house system, good connectivity, promotion of farm exports, new quality training system for production and processing units, subsidy and loans, he added.

‘There is a provision of ₹ 20 lakh subsidy for general category and ₹ 30 lakh for women and Scheduled Castes for the establishment of ‘recycling aquaculture system’, he said, adding that with a project of ₹ 50 lakh in an area of 1,000 square metres, one can produce 25-30 tonnes of fish every year and ₹ 12.5 crore fisheries projects for the division have already been prepared. Agrawal instructed the officers of vari-

ous districts to give all the new fishery ponds on the lease and renew the old ponds apart from and ensuring fisheries there. ‘Fish seedling is also a good source of income, in which by spending 11 paise on a seed one can earn ₹ 1.40 in 90 days,’ he said, instructing the officers to ensure forming at least 10 Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) in every district, helping them get export licenses and promoting

farming of vegetables and fruits in clusters so that the farmers can get full benefits. DC said that every facility is available in Varanasi and once farmers get the benefits they would themselves come forward as by quality production one can increase income by 5-6 times. ‘There is a scheme of getting Central Government assistance from ₹ 50 to ₹ 500 crore for setting up of large units of milk and meat processing. For this,

₹ 15,000 crore have been allocated under the economic package,’ he said, appealing to interested persons to make projects by getting information about the entire process from Additional Director (Animal Husbandry). The meeting was also attended by District Magistrates Kaushal Raj Sharma (Varanasi), Navneet Singh Chahal (Chandauli), MP Singh (Ghazipur) and DK Singh (Jaunpur).

# Traders urge SSP to enhance police patrolling in markets

The city has witnessed an increase in the criminal incidents during the last few days and the traders have been the main target of the criminals and the criminals have mainly targeted the traders engaged in the trade of jewellery and big businessmen. Moreover,

the economic activities will increase in the festival season to begin with the auspicious occasion of Shasrdaya Navratri beginning from October 17.

In such a situation, the police should enhance their patrolling particularly in the important market during the festival season, urged a delegation of Udyog Vyapar Samiti to the SSP Amit Pathak during its meeting with him at his office in Collectorate, here. The delegation urged the SSP to direct the incharge police stations of city areas to conduct regular patrolling not only during the day hours but also at night to instill a sense of security among business-

men. The SSP himself should monitor this, the delegation added.

The SP, Traffic has issued a new guideline under which the owners of four-wheeler and two-wheelers need to show number plates at both the front and back side of vehicles.

There will be penalty of ₹ 5000 on the mistake in the number plates, the delegation said urging the SSP, the traders are already facing economic crisis because of COVID-19 pandemic and thus, they could be given some months before implementing the guidelines so as they could make correction in the fault on number plates if

there is any.

The SSP paid serious attention towards the problems that the delegation put before him and assured of starting the monthly meeting between cops and traders at police station level to establish better coordination to understand the genuine problem. The SSP also assured the delegation to hold a talk with SP, Traffic regarding new guidelines about traffic rule.

# 146 more test positive in Prayagraj

There was a bit of relief for the denizens related to corona infection. Even after increasing the scope of testing, suddenly the figure of infected persons fell below 150. In the district, 4,707 suspected patients were screened within 24 hours. On Monday night, the number of positive patients was detected only 146. The special thing is that almost two and a half months from July 30, the day came when no one died of Covid infection.

According to CMO Dr GS Bajpai, the corona testing and contract tracing work in the district is being accelerated every day. On Monday, the number of positive patients stood at 146. A total of 229 people beat Corona. In which 23 patients were discharged from various Covid hospitals and Covid care centres.

The number of patients admitted to hospitals is also increasing, 206 people completed home isolation. The number of people living in homes free of corona infection has now increased to 14,359. According to the CMO, 3,136 people have tested through antigen, 1,324 from RTPCR, 118 from Trunat and 129 from private labs during the 24 hours in the district.

# HC grants bail to Azam, wife & son

The Allahabad High Court on Tuesday granted bail to senior Samajwadi Party leader Azam Khan, his wife, Tazeen Fatima and son Abdullah Azam Khan in a fake birth certificate case pending in Rampur district.

However, the court said that Abdullah Azam Khan and his mother shall be released immediately but Azam Khan will only be released on bail after the statement of the First informant/complainant in the case is recorded by the trial court.

Justice Sidharth passed the order in bail applications filed by Azam Khan, his wife, Tazeen Fatima and son, Abdullah Azam Khan.

According to petitioners, the offence of obtaining fake birth certificate of Abdullah would not travel beyond the purview of Section 23 of the Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1969, which pro-

vides that any information given for the purpose of being inserted in any register of births and deaths, which is known or believed by person giving information to be false, shall be punished with fine, which may extend to ₹ 50 .

State government opposed the bail application on the ground that the fake birth certificate was used by Abdullah to contest the state election and his father and mother helped him in obtaining the fake certificate and if released on bail applicant will tamper with witnesses.

The court after hearing concerned parties allowed the bail application of three accused.

It is to recall that last year, an FIR was lodged by one, Akash Saxena at Ganj police station of Rampur, alleging that Mohd Azam Khan and Tazeen Fatima have got two birth certificates issued from two places, one dated January 28, 2012, from

Nagar Palika Parishad, Rampur and second dated April 21, 2015, from Nagar Nigam, Lucknow, regarding birth of their son, Mohd. Abdullah Azam Khan.

At the outset GM congratulated Amitabh DRM Prayagraj Division and PD Mishra PCSO NCR on successful completion of their current assignments and wished them successful future ahead. Chaudhry said that under the able leadership of Amitabh Prayagraj Division achieved many milestones including successful conduct of Kumbh-2019. Through its order dated October 12, 2020 Railway Board has decided to post Mohit Chandra as DRM Prayagraj on completion of tenure of present incumbent Amitabh. Similarly, PD Mishra shall also be joining as Chief Electric Loco Engineer on NCR

itself under his lateral transfer from present post of PCSO NCR.

Reviewing safety GM stressed that quality material input and proper workmanship are extremely critical for safe and breakdown free maintenance of assets. He stressed that all user departments must ensure that only proven quality material be used in maintenance and operation of Railway assets. Enhancing safety in rolling stock operation, Prayagraj division has commissioned new Wheel Impact Load Detector (WILD) in UP line between Chunar-Dagmagpur which will help in automatic detection of flat wheel in coaches, wagons and locomotives and other defects causing high impact load and will send alert to control and maintenance personnel without any human intervention. Likewise, Automatic Train Examination System (ATES) capable of identifying hot axle, brake binding etc. in all type of rolling stock and sending alert automatically is commissioned

in UP main line at Shikohabad. These equipment are commissioned as part of master plan prepared by North Central Railway for installing automated way side rolling stock monitoring systems at interval of every 100 kms over its entire territory. This safety grid will supplement efforts of enroute train passing staff and will also pave the way for safe and detention free train operations at higher speeds. DRM Prayagraj informed that two more ATES in UP direction one each at Meja and Khaga are under final stages of commissioning and expected to be operational soon. GM Chaudhry stressed that selection of equipment and location should be done as per already finalised master plan so as machine based automatic defect detection capabilities are evenly distributed.

To decongest Kanpur Central Station, Govindpuri is being developed as satellite station for shifting some of the passing and originating trains from Kanpur Central to

Govindpuri. Status of works at Govindpuri stations was discussed in the meeting and it was decided that after commissioning of train watering facility at Govindpuri it can function as satellite station to Kanpur Central. Accordingly it was decided to expedite works related to provision of watering hydrant and overhead water tank etc. at Govindpuri station. Besides this, progress of important yard remodeling and associated signaling and TRD works for Kosikalan, Ghasinagar and Kanpur area was also discussed. GM said that planning for non-interlocking (NI) work at these locations be done in such a way to have minimum impact on train operations.

Security arrangement at stations and escorting of trains by security personnel over NCR were also reviewed. GM stressed that in view of ensuing festive season, security arrangement in station and trains be increased and directed divisions to augment resources at required stations and trains.

Siddharth Nath Singh reacted to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's statement about the Prime Minister's plane. He said that he does not understand when Rahul will grow up. It looks like he is still

in diapers, he said adding that the CBI is investigating the Hathras incident and the victim will get justice.

# Gang of tricksters busted

Police recovered 13 golden colour metal biscuits, three keypad mobile phones and ₹1840 in cash from them. Meanwhile, another gang member suddenly recovers the lost biscuits and offer innocent passengers to buy them. The third and fourth gang members present in the crowd agree to buy these biscuits at higher price to earn people's faith to adjudge their value.

People get soon lured to buy these biscuits presuming them to be of real gold. After recovering cash, all the gang members soon disappear from the spot.

During test by the goldsmith, these biscuits were found to be of yellow metal only. Police team was led by SHO Babupurwa Janardan Pratap Singh and Sub-Inspector Arpit Tewari.

## Presses to adhere to ECI directives on election material

Additional District Magistrate (City) Atul Kumar while addressing a meeting of proprietors and owners of printing press directed them to strictly adhere to the directives of the Election Commission of India.

He said the printing presses would have to bring to the notice of the returning officer before printing any election material. He said once the approval had been obtained, then only the election material could be printed at the press concerned.

He said this was applicable on all election material, including posters, banners, placards, pamphlets, handbills and other poll related material.

After the death of his mother about six years ago, Vaibhav had become mentally upset. After writing 'I love you very much Mom' in the suicide note, Vaibhav hanged himself.

The CRS carried out a thorough inspection of traffic



management on the double line at Taraon railway station by inspection vehicle. During this time he thoroughly inspected 25,000 bolts, 50 Hz, AC traction power station, including electrification works, new building, passenger facilities, platform length, foot over bridge, station panel, CHC crank handle, station working rule, relay room, point crossing, signal and sighting board etc. On push trolley on the Taraon-Saidpur Bhatri rail section he inspected the 25,000 bolts, 50 Hz, AC traction line fittings, sighting boards, over head lines, power sub-stations, level crossing gates, curvature and bridges. During this time Latif inspected on the doubled rail section between two block sections of Audihar station new line fitting as per standards and new signals installed on them, turnouts, ballast and packing, adequate clearance on curvature, plants and crossing, over head line, railway track fittings,

electrified colour light signal, overhead line fittings, relay room, crank handle, block instrument, overlap, signal overlap, fouling mark, foot overbridge, new platform and passenger safety etc. On this section he ensured the installation of boom locks at all level crossing gates as per doubled rail section and of height gauges as per electrified rail section. The doubling of Taraon, Saidpur Bhatri and Aunrihar railway stations falling in this section together with electrification by 25000 volt, 50 Hz, AC traction were inspected according to the standards. It may be pointed out here that under the ongoing doubling project between Aunrihar-Chhapra in Aunrihar-Taraon 12 km rail station the work of newly-constructed second line and electrified section has been completed. This will benefit the trains running on this section in the form of fast and uninterrupted operation.

# Cong, Left slam Govt financial package

The Rajya Saha member alleged that it is also an admis-

sion that the earlier "₹20 lakh crore package" was a failure and termed it a "hoax". He also said that by the latest announce-ments, the Government is trying to interfere in people's lives by telling them how to spend their own money.

"After carefully reading the statement of the finance minister on the so-called stimulus package, I am reminded of the Hindi proverb 'Khoda Pahaad, Nikla Chuha' or loosely translated, it means 'dig a mountain and find a mouse'. The grand announcement yesterday was no stimulus package to push economic growth, it was another sly attempt to dazzle the people with exaggerated numbers and lead them to believe that the government is hands-on and responsive to the needs of the people and the economy,"

Chidambaram said at AICC Press briefing.

The former finance minister said it is also a candid confession that the earlier so-called "₹20 lakh crore package was a massive failure". "It was a failure because it was a hoax," he said.

Chidambaram said the numbers claimed in the package are a "hoax" as the stimulus is not of a value of ₹73,000 crore, as claimed, but merely 0.1 per cent of GDP, as estimated by some economists.

The Congress leader also alleged that the Government is also trying to play the role of "maa-baap" by telling employees what amount and on what goods and when they should spend their own money.

# Odisha's plan to fell 1 lakh trees for mining op faces FAC hurdle

The Odisha Government has proposed axing over one lakh trees on behalf of Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL), a coal mining company jointly owned by the Government of Telangana and Government of India, for conducting mining operations in the Naini block in Angul district in the State.

However, the proposal has been put on hold by the Forest Advisory Committee (FAC) of the Union Environment Ministry after it found that there were discrepancies in the number of trees that will be felled in various reports submitted by the various agencies. "As per DFO report, it is 1,06,536 trees, whereas RCCF reported 1,06,209, and the SIR (site inspection report) of Regional office reported 1,05,092 trees," said the panel headed by Dr Sanjay Kumar, Director General of Forests and Special Secretary in the Ministry in minutes of meeting held on September 21, 2020.

The FAC was studying the Odisha Government's proposal for diversion of 783.275 hectares of forest land consisting of 643.095 hectares of reserve forest in Chhendipada and Kankurupal Reserved Forest and 140.180 hectares of village forest land in Chhendipada Range of Angul Division for Naini Coal Block (Open Cast) in Angul district, Odisha for SCCL.

According to the SCCL, Naini would boost its output, which was aiming to produce one crore tonnes of coal every year and has targeted commencement of production by February 2021.

A total lease area (912.799 hectares) for mining was sought for 40 years. However, throwing the spanner on the SCCL plans, the FAC had various reasons to defer the proposal. The SIR report which pointed out that elephant movement was reported in the northern and southern part of lease area was yet another reason.

"Also, if the area is mined out, the surrounding villages will be impacted more. So a detailed mitigation plan needs to be prepared for avoiding human-animal conflict in future and for providing safe passage to elephants," said the FAC quoting the SIR report prepared by RK Samal, DIG of Forest in the Central Ministry.

It also suggested constructing an underpass on SH 63 to prevent jumbo getting killed in road mishaps. The Committee also took exception that while the State Government has recommended compensatory afforestation over degraded forest land equivalent to double the area proposed for diversion, it is proposed in reserved forests.

The State Government shall explore the option of finding degraded forest area

outside the notified forests considering that the reserved forest option is available for proposals of the Central Government and the CPSU only.

The FAC also expressed its concern over the State Government's proposal to set up a coal washery in the forest land (40 hectares), a portion in the project area.

"The State Government shall explore the possibility of establishing the coal washery, which is a non-site specific use, on non-forest area. The alternatives explored may be submitted," said the FAC which also expressed concerned that the substantial outflow of wastewater from a washery might have negative impact on the flora and fauna of the locality.

"All mitigation measures that are essential to minimise the impact of the proposed washery shall be listed if it could not be located outside forest land," said the FAC.

Movement of elephants has been reported in the northern and southern part of lease area. It is also reported that the proposed Similipal-Satkosika Tiger Corridor is about 8.12 km on the north side of the proposed project. Mining in the area is likely to cause Human-animal conflict in the area. Comments in this regard shall be sought from NTCA and Project Elephant Division of the Environment Ministry, it said.

# Practise better hygiene during winter: Govt

## Seasonal epidemic-prone diseases such as dengue, malaria, H1N1 occur during this period, says Health Ministry

As it warned that Covid-19 is a respiratory virus and most such pathogens escalate during winter calling better hygiene practices, the Union Health Ministry on Tuesday issued guidelines for the management of co-infection of the coronavirus with other seasonal epidemic-prone diseases such as dengue, malaria, seasonal influenza (H1N1), etc.

"Given the seasonal pattern of epidemic-prone diseases observed every year in our country, diseases like dengue, malaria, seasonal influenza, leptospirosis, chikungunya, enteric fever, etc. can not only present a diagnostic dilemma but may co-exist in Covid-19 cases. This poses challenges in the clinical and laboratory diagnosis of Covid-19, and may have a bearing on clinical management and patient outcomes," said the statement.

"The scope of this document is to provide clear guidelines on prevention and treatment of co-infections..." the statement further read.

The document is based on the standards set up by inter-



national health agencies such as the World Health Organization (WHO), which say that apart from fever, patients could present other symptoms mimicking Covid-19 making the diagnosis difficult.

A high index of suspicion must be maintained for these epidemic-prone diseases prevalent in a particular geographic region during monsoon and post-monsoon seasons. Bacterial co-infections must also be suspected in moderate or severe cases of Covid-19 not responding to treatment, said the guidelines.

Despite the possibility of various co-infections, in present times of the pandemic, the approach to diagnosis for Covid-19 essentially remains the same. Testing protocol as per the ministry of health and family welfare and Indian Council of Medical Research guidelines will be followed. However, in addition, further tests for a likely co-

# Poll for 11 UP, U'khand RS seats on Nov 9

The Election Commission (EC) on Tuesday announced that elections for 11 Rajya Sabha seats - 10 from Uttar Pradesh and one from Uttarakhand - will be held on November 9. The counting will also be held on the same day.

In the last Parliament session, Rajya Sabha bid farewell to 11 of its members who are due to retire in November this year. They include Civil Aviation Minister Hardeep Singh Puri, Samajwadi Party leader Ram Gopal Yadav, BSP's Veer Singh and Raj Babbar of Congress. Others who will retire are: Javed Ali Khan (SP), P L Punia (Congress), Rajaram (BSP), Neeraj Shekhar (BJP), Arun Singh

(BJP), Ravi Prakash Verma (SP) and Chandrapal Singh Yadav (SP).

Masks, thermal scanning, and use of sanitisers will be ensured to check the spread of coronavirus, which has affected over 70 lakh people in India so far. The government-mandated rules on social distancing will also be strictly followed, the EC said in a statement.

The EC The official statement further said that "chief electoral officers as observers in the two states" have been appointed, and the chief secretaries of the two states have been directed to "depute a senior officer to ensure the instructions regarding COVID-19 containment measures are complied with, while making arrangements for conducting the elections."

## NIA conduct searches in Purnea case

**New Delhi:** The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Tuesday conducted searches in connection with the Purnea Arms Case. The house of Chandra Vijay Pratap alias Sushil of Patna and premises of Sanmario Pharmaceuticals Private Limited, Patna were searched. Chandra Vijay Pratap is the Director of the accused firm Sanmario pharmaceuticals.

The case pertains to interdiction of an SUV and seizure of highly sophisticated weapons and ammunition on February 7, 2019 by Purnea Police from three persons---Suraj Prasad, Varenghow Kahorgam and Cleason Kabo. The weapons included two Under Barrel Grenade Launchers (UBGL), one AK series rifle and 1,800 rounds of 5.56 mm ammunition which were kept concealed and were being transported by the above mentioned three persons in the SUV. The local police registered an FIR No. 35/19 dated February 7 last year at Police Station Baisi against the three accused persons. The NIA re-registered the case as RC-05/2019/NIA-DLI dated February 28, 2019, under various Sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act and various provisions of the IPC and Arms Act. During its investigation, the NIA arrested four more accused namely Tripuari Singh, Mukesh Singh, Ningkhan Sangtam and Santosh Singh and filed chargesheet against the seven accused persons.

# Males constitute 70% of overall Covid-19 deaths

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

Gender-wise nearly 70 per cent of those who have died due to coronavirus so far are males while age-wise, about 53 per cent Covid-19 deaths are of patients aged 60 and above, about 35 per cent deaths are of patients in 45 to 60 years age group and 10 per cent in 26 to 44 years age group.

Sharing the details of the profile of the people who succumbed to the virus, Union

Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan said, "gender wise, 30 per cent deaths are in female and 70 per cent in male".

He further added, India's case fatality rate is 1.53 per cent compared to 17.9 per cent with comorbid people and 1.2 per cent for people without comorbidities.

As per the existing mortality figures, nearly 17.9 per cent of people with co-morbidities have succumbed to the infection as compared to 1.2 per cent of those who are not

suffering from any pre-existing chronic disease conditions.

Among those above 60, the share goes up to 24.6 per cent as against 4.8 per cent in the same age group without any co-morbidities.

Rajesh Bhushan also warned that, "Young people in the country feel that they will not be affected by Covid-19 and even if they are infected they will recover fast. There is a need for the youth to get out of this misconception."

are effective in general practice use, VK Paul said.

Amit Khare, Secretary, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting also said that the intensive Jan Andolan campaign for Covid-19 Appropriate Behaviour launched for two months particularly during festival time, October and November, will continue in various forms till March.

# Now, cow dung-made diyas on Diwali to boost Modi's AtmaNirbhar Bharat abhiyan

After promoting use of cow urine and cow dung-based products such as hand sanitisers and face masks to check spread of Covid-19, Diwali this year may see lamps (diyas) candles, dhoop, agarbatti (incense stick), havan materials, shubb-labh, swastik, sam-rani, hardboard, wall-piece, paper-weight, havan materials, idols of Ganesha and Lakshmi made out of cow dung, a virtual end of Chinese products. The Rashtriya Kamdhenu Aayog (RKA) has planned to produce 33 crore eco-friendly earthen lamps (diyas) made from cow dung this festive season, in order to counter Chinese products. It is estimated that about 192 crore kg of cow dung per day is produced in India at present.

"The upcoming campaign to use diyas, made from cow dung, will will counter the Chinese made lamps and thus boost the 'make in India' concept of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's atma nirbhar bharat abhiyan. The Aayog is targeting production of 33 crore eco-friendly cow dung made diyas this diwali. There is huge untapped potential in cow dung-based products," RKA chairman Vallabh Bhai Kathiriyaa said.

"More than 15 States including Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, have agreed to be part of the campaign. About three lakh diyas will be lit in the holy city of Ayodhya, while one lakh diyas in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh, he said.

"The manufacturing has

started. A group of students from the Indian Institute of Technology Delhi has come out with an online platform for marketing these cow dung made diyas and have already placed an order for nearly one crore diyas," Kathiriyaa said. Under the campaign, all gaushalas in the country are passing economic uncertainty because of Covid-19. Making diyas and other products like nameplates and idols using cow dung will help them to be self-reliant.

The Aayog said though it is not directly involved in production of cow dung-based products, it is facilitating and offering training to self help groups and entrepreneurs seeking to set up business. According to officials, the process of making these diyas is quite interesting. First, the Gobar is dried and powdered in a machine, following which compostable adhesives like tamarind seed paste is added for binding.

Then, dried herbs are added for fragrance and preservation, the dough is kneaded and placed into diya-shaped moulds. Once dried, the diyas are painted with all-natural colours and ornate motifs. Made out of cow dung, dried and powdered herbs and tamarind seed paste - the cow dung diyas are 100 per cent eco-friendly and can last a long time. Even if they are discarded after the festivities, they will decompose in a jiffy, leaving no residue. The cost of such diyas are between ₹4 to ₹20 depending on their size and decorative intricacy.

It will boost up in making cow shelters atma nirbhar too," he added.

# Snubbed by RJD-Cong, NCP to go it alone

**Mumbai:** The NCP will contest the Bihar Assembly polls independently after it was not allotted any seat by the RJD-Congress alliance with which it wanted to tie-up in the state, senior party leader Praful Patel said on Tuesday.

Patel said the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) was ready to go with the 'Mahagathbandhan' (mega alliance) of the RJD-Congress in the eastern state, but it was not ceded a single seat by the opposition combine.

He said it is not possible for the NCP to join forces with its ally in Maharashtra, the Shiv Sena, for the October-November polls as its workers

from Bihar are for contesting the election independently.

Besides the Shiv Sena, the Sharad Pawar-led party is also an ally of the Congress in Maharashtra.

"We had been with them (RJD-Congress) previously too. Yet, the RJD and the Congress have not ceded a single seat to us this time despite talks. Hence, the NCP will contest the polls independently," the former Union Minister said.

Patel said he had discussed the tie-up issue with Congress leaders Ahmed Patel, Shaktisinh Gohil and RJD's Tejashwi Yadav, who is the face of the opposition

alliance. Yet, the Congress did not find it right to leave some seats for the NCP, he said.

The former Union minister said the NCP had demanded only five seats, out of the total 243, as part of the possible understanding among the parties.

On one hand, they say all should come together to face the BJP-JD(U) (in Bihar). But on the other, they do not give importance to other parties. "This position of theirs is very unfortunate," Patel said, hitting out at the opposition alliance.

The NCP leader said 'Mahagathbandhan' parties should not blame others if they suffer losses in the

polls. He said it is not possible for the NCP to join forces with the Shiv Sena for the Bihar polls.

Our local workers are of the view of contesting the polls independently. Hence, we will not reach any understanding with the Shiv Sena in Bihar, Patel added.

The NCP has not yet announced how many Assembly seats it will contest in Bihar.

However, the party has already announced a list of 40 star campaigners for the three-phase Bihar polls to be held on October 28, November 3 and November 7.

Counting of votes will take place on November 10.

# Explosion in Kolkata club: BJP wants NIA probe

The BJP has demanded a National Investigation Agency probe into the massive blast that on Tuesday rocked a building housing a local club in north Kolkata's Beliaghata area ripping apart the walls and blowing off the roof of the room where the explosion occurred.

The explosion occurred early on Tuesday morning. No one, however, sustained injuries in the blast that occurred on the second floor of the club building on Beliaghata Main Road, police said adding they were "looking into the matter".

A team of forensic experts

reached the explosion site to collect evidence, and sniffer dogs were also pressed into service to gather clues officials said.

"We heard a huge explosion, following which we rushed out of our houses and found two persons fleeing. Their faces were covered... We do not know what exactly happened," a resident of the area said.

Even as opposition BJP upped the ante against the Mamata Banerjee Government, party MP Locket Chatterjee said, "this blast is another instance of criminalization of Bengal and its deteriorating law and order situation," blaming a Trinamool Congress hand behind the blasts.

"Everyone knows that Belegghata is one place in Kolkata where no elections take place... where no one is allowed to vote be it parliamentary or Assembly or municipal elections... this is one region where only gonda raj of TMC prevails. Hence we demand an NIA investigation into the facts that led to the blast," she said while police suspected local goons were behind the blast. "It seems that there was a huge stockpile of explosives which were being used to produce country-made bombs when things went wrong leading to the blast," a police officer said.

The impact of the explosion was such that two walls of the

room where the materials were stored caved in and the asbestos roof flew off. Window panes of houses about 60 feet away got shattered under the impact of the blast, sources said.

Even as a BJP team led by Chatterjee was prevented from entering the Belegghata area, Bengal Minister Firhad Hakim launched a counterattack on the saffron outfit saying "we are not Gujarat or UP or any other BJP ruled state that crimes and criminals will go unpunished. Any criminal from any party involved in the crime would be brought to book and there is no need for the BJP leaders to create a ruckus to win political brownie points because."

## Safety first

J&J halts trials after a participant falls ill. This shows why developers must not cut corners under political pressure



Before there is a sense of desolateness, let's go by certain facts. First, vaccine trials are a time-consuming process of trial and error, of meticulous checks and balances and a constant re-assessment of risks and formulaic tweaks if any to ensure that the final product is safe and effective for the human body. Second, there are a lot of vaccine candidates being tested at various advanced stages of trials with encouraging outcomes so far and there is no reason to lose hope. Which is why Union Health Minister Harsh Vardhan said that India would have a vaccine for the novel Coronavirus from maybe more than one source by early next year. Currently, two

indigenously-developed vaccine candidates, one by Bharat Biotech in collaboration with ICMR and the other by Zydus Cadila Ltd, are in phase II of the human clinical trials. The Pune-based Serum Institute of India, which has partnered with AstraZeneca for manufacturing the Oxford COVID-19 vaccine candidate, is conducting phase II and III human clinical trials. So though pharma major Johnson & Johnson (J&J) has halted clinical trials of its variant after a participant fell ill, probably slowing down US President Donald Trump's ambition of rolling out a vaccine commercially before the November polls, there is still hope. The company said that the participant's illness is being evaluated and that it would share more information after a further study into the cause for the adverse reaction to the trial vaccine. This comes on the back of British pharmaceutical firm AstraZeneca stopping its vaccine tests after a volunteer fell sick. Though the tests have resumed in a number of other nations like UK, Brazil and South Africa, they are still on hold in the US for further scrutiny. Why people are upset about J&J's sudden halt is because it is among a small group of vaccine makers which has progressed into final-stage human studies. The firm is dosing thousands of volunteers in the first big trial of a COVID-19 inoculation that may work after one shot. Others probably need more than one.

Though J&J is in a mad race to find the silver bullet along with rival drug firms from around the world, both scientists and the healthcare fraternity have time and time again cautioned that pharmaceutical companies must balance time pressures with safety considerations in the crucial last stage of testing. And the fact that two of the frontrunners for the vaccine have halted work on their samples is actually a good sign that developers are not throwing caution to the wind in order to claim the highest price that awaits the one who comes out with the vaccine first. Plus it is a sign that companies are not giving in to political pressure that they are under to deliver a cure fast as the contagion continues to spread and sicken people and economies. No compromises can be made to meet the improbable timelines that are being set by Governments keen to reassure their citizens. Developmental processes that usually take years have been compressed into months, raising genuine concerns over the safety and efficacy of the quick fix shot that will come out eventually. However, the people's faith in the vaccine that comes out eventually will be vital if health authorities hope to be able to convince millions globally that they must get a shot. That's why developers have publicly pledged not to compromise on any scientific requirements for the vaccine. Microsoft co-founder Bill Gates gave voice to people's concerns when he said that normalcy would return to the world "when we have not the first generation of vaccines, but one that is super-effective and widely available. Only then all the problems created by COVID-19 can be solved." Then there is the politics of distribution, what with rich nations having already booked the lion's share of an expected rollout and poorer nations having to wait in the queue. For a country like India, it needs to ready a cold chain infrastructure real soon to preserve the vaccines so that they don't lose their efficacy. In that case, normalcy will be a long time coming because we have not even got the first generation of vaccines yet. Till then prevention is the best cure.

## They hate love stories

Jewellery brand caves in to vicious trolls, takes down ad celebrating inter-faith marriage. Why let bigotry win the day?



When a corporate giant with an indisputable standing takes down an ad of its jewellery company that celebrates inter-faith marriage and the birth of a baby resulting from that union — simply bowing to the majoritarian sentiment of the day — then we should worry about the India of tomorrow. For it means that the politics of polarisation has completely taken over the cultural domain and the nation's collective mindspace. The ad had a beautiful story of a Hindu-Muslim marriage, where the Muslim mother-in-law is seen to have arranged a *godh bharai* or baby shower ritual for her Hindu daughter-in-law, an example of the inclusivity and

love that the brand wanted to communicate. But Right-wing trolls ripped it to shreds, saying it promoted love *jihad*. This after our literature and films have forever celebrated the plurality of Indian life and the countless inter-faith marriages in reality. Besides, the ad showed that the woman was free to pursue her own religion and rituals in her marital home and was not co-opted. The love *jihad* messages flooded social media to such an extent that the company removed the video campaign rather than risk negative publicity. In other words, the boycott calls and the cancel culture are assuming such hydra-headed dimensions that they are potent enough to determine market economics now. The sad part is if bona fide corporations take a step back and let the dominant sentiment take over, it only lionises bigotry. The sadder part is that the same jewellery brand has used its festival campaigns to convey beautiful social messages before. The saddest part is that many controversial ads have been pulled out after a public outcry, mostly because they were of a sexual nature and not for conveying the story of a confluence of religion and culture in family life.

Many proponents of Hindutva claimed victory after the ad was withdrawn but can they ever stop the harmony and plurality embedded in our civilisational DNA? A similar reaction was seen when a detergent brand tried something similar with its Holi campaign last year. The one-minute long video featured a young Hindu girl, who chose to be drenched in colours to protect her young Muslim friend, who wanted to visit a nearby mosque. Some felt that Holi wasn't given due importance and others shuddered at the thought of a Muslim man needing protection from a woman, that too, a Hindu. Advertisers force disruptions in the clutter and make us sit up and think, setting up an alternative or reasoned conversation. Today even that space has shrunk. It isn't news that most Indian families still prefer weddings being arranged within their religion and caste. Those who break the rules and are not privileged with power or education have often witnessed violent consequences, including "honour killings." According to the India Human Development Survey, only about five per cent of all marriages are inter-caste and inter-faith relations are even fewer. A 2016 survey by Social Attitudes Research for India (SARI) found that the majority of respondents opposed inter-caste and inter-religious marriages. In Delhi, about 60 per cent of Hindus said they would oppose a child or relative marrying a Muslim and a similar fraction of Muslims opposed a child or relative marrying a Hindu. In Uttar Pradesh, the prejudice was even deeper — about 75 per cent of Hindus opposed marriages with Muslims, and only a slightly lower fraction of Muslims, about 70 per cent, opposed marriages with Hindus. Not to forget that in 2018, the Facebook page that called for violence against 102 Muslim men, who were allegedly in relationships with Hindu women, had to be taken down. Then there are legal challenges for couples trying to get a marriage registered under the Special Marriage Act, where courts insist on all sorts of conditions like ensuring the marriage notice is publicised in local media. And in all this, love is never under discussion. And after yesterday, it doesn't even make for a story.

## Keep the momentum going

### The methodology adopted in the next 18 months will be crucial for Rahul Gandhi and the Congress. It will determine their success in the 2024 general elections

Congress MP Rahul Gandhi, understood to be the de facto president of his party, made a hectic rendezvous in the heat and dust with the farmers of Punjab and to some extent with those in Haryana on the farm Acts. Some observers once again termed his latest avatar as "version 2.0 or 3.0", depending on how they saw the political graph and career of the Gandhi scion.

The visits got good traction in both the States, particularly in Punjab, as the Congress is not only the ruling party there, it is in a position to organise the machinery for protest marches and public meetings. Plus there is resentment against the laws across the State and among all parties, except for the BJP, which initiated the Acts.

The two political protests in a row — first in Hathras, Uttar Pradesh, in support of the Dalit woman who was gang-raped by upper caste men, followed by the one in the food bowl of the country, Punjab and Haryana — catapulted him into the public eye. And he did seize the first mover advantage on both these issues. At least now he is being viewed as some sort of a "fighter" rather than a "shirker." Also, since these visits are not related to elections but concern specific issues, the images and footprints of both Hathras and Punjab would remain imprinted on the public consciousness for a while. The image of Rahul being roughed up by cops, consoling the victim's father in Hathras and riding a tractor in Punjab would help his cause immensely in the medium to long run.

But there is a rider. Rahul has shown consistently that he adopts a strategy and abandons it completely and goes for a long political vacation. Hathras and Punjab — the cause of a Dalit girl and farmers, besides other issues of the subaltern — need to be sustained and adopted in the long term political strategy of the Congress and should not remain a photo opportunity alone. Adopted for a while and then abandoned, something which had become Rahul's signature for long, the news-grabbing moments gave his opposition repeated opportunity to project him as a politician aloof from the grind, not suited for the heat and dust or the combative brand of grassroots politics. This image can be altered only when



there is consistency in his political approach followed by an action plan for each and every issue which concerns the people at large. You cannot be a part-time agitator and also a part-time tourist vacationing in a foreign country when face to face with an extremely combative adversary who is better planned and always a step ahead.

Remember the temple-hopping spree of Rahul and his attempt to sport a *Janeu* by proclaiming himself as a Dattatreya Brahmin in the run-up to the last Lok Sabha polls? No one, not even Rahul himself, knows what happened to those half-hearted attempts to play the majority religion card and the efficacy of the strategy itself. No one has even asked him if he had gone to a temple after those photo ops and does he wear a *Janeu* now. Perhaps after getting a thorough drubbing in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, the Congress strategists who advised him and he himself realised that this was not going to cut any ice with the voters and abandoned the discourse.

Long ago, when the UPA was in power and Rahul was calling the shots, he used to occasionally visit Dalit hamlets in parts of UP and used to spend the evenings and nights there, trying to understand what the downtrodden faced. Once, in 2009, he even took the visiting British Foreign Secretary David Miliband along with him to spend a night in such a household, which became a media sensation worldwide. But this practice, too, was abandoned summarily, suggesting a lack of consistency and strategy in the

political methodology adopted. No one has heard if he ever spent a night in a rural household after the Congress-led UPA was ousted from power in the 2014 general elections.

Remember, the Hathras visit came nine years after his much publicised visit to Bhatta Parsaul village in Greater Noida area during a farmers' agitation, when they were protesting against alleged forcible land acquisition. He was pillion riding a motorcycle then and had entered the village in solidarity with the agitating farmers and sat on a *dharma* with them. The Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) was ruling the State then with Mayawati as Chief Minister and Rahul was detained for a few hours. Of course, the Congress-led Government at the Centre subsequently passed the Land Acquisition Act, 2013, which raised the compensation given to farmers manifold.

Bhatta-Parsaul was a success story of sorts, which led to the passage of a Bill, considered extremely friendly to farmers if any Government/private agency wanted to acquire the land. But Rahul failed to publicise this success story. Perhaps not realising its significance, he and his party let go of an opportunity which could have helped both politically. On the contrary, the Congress became defensive when its political opponents targeted it over the Bill, saying it hampered easy land acquisition and prevented industrialists from setting up new units and giving employment.

Rahul has been put through tough scrutiny all these years, more so in the post-2014 era when the Congress lost to the

BJP lock, stock and barrel and the decline continued like a free fall. In 2017, as Congress president, Rahul did a magnificent job for his party by trying to halt the BJP juggernaut in its strongest base for decades — Gujarat. The party lost but did put up a spirited fight against the political giants — Prime Minister Narendra Modi and then BJP president Amit Shah — both from the same State. The performance of the underdog (Congress) was hailed and it was billed as a new beginning, a new dawn for Congress. This performance was followed by Karnataka where the incumbent Congress government did reasonably well and prevented the BJP from claiming power. Victories in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan added to Rahul's stature and the possibilities of a Congress revival became real. But come May 2019 and all advantage was lost. The party simply could not build the momentum or keep the pressure and lost out on issues to tackle its opponent, driven as it was by aggressive nationalism and Hindutva. It simply had no answer to the blitzkrieg launched by the BJP in 2019 and surrendered meekly without even putting up a semblance of a fight.

The question now is when the momentum seems to have slightly become favourable with Hathras and the farmers' issues, will the party, particularly Rahul, be able to sustain it in the medium to long term? That will be a challenge and also provide answers to the political discourse in the run-up to a series of Assembly elections in the next one-and-a-half years.

Many Congress leaders privately say that the practice of starting a campaign or a narrative and then abandoning it midway has to come to an end. A narrative, once adopted and made a part of political strategy, has to continue and given an incubation time. Only then can one build momentum and swing tides of opinion. Partymen need to be consistent and have to hit the streets every two to three weeks to get traction and occupy the opposition space, not wake up every three years.

The Uttar Pradesh Assembly polls, scheduled for February and March 2022, are less than one-and-a-half years away. A State where BJP is firmly entrenched under Yogi Adityanath as Chief Minister, the Congress is still considered to be a rank outsider at this juncture despite Hathras and despite the absence of Samajwadi Party (SP) and the BSP from the politics of agitation. Can Congress fill the vacuum here? Can it spring a surprise? Will the Rahul-Priyanka duo be able to project themselves as some sort of an alternative and replace the caste narrative of SP and BSP? Will they come out with a game-changer? Do they have it in them? This is what Congress leaders and workers alike are asking. For many within the party and outside, the revival of the organisation in UP is the key for success in the 2024 general elections. The road to Delhi goes through UP was an old saying but this holds true even at this juncture where a great churning of the political process is taking place.

### Impact on farmers

Sir — The farm Acts are here to haunt the nation largely due to the growing mistrust in the Government as it hurriedly pushed through the laws without any conversation with farmers' unions. The first inkling of the Government's intent in the agriculture sector was evident in the report submitted by the Shanta

Kumar Committee, which was constituted in August 2014, within three months of the BJP coming to power. The Centre was averse to the Food Corporation of India (FCI) intermediating purchase and storage of agricultural produce. Its deep-seated intention was to dilute its institutional involvement in food procurement and allocation. Recommendations were made for substantial reduction of beneficiaries under the Food Security Act and bringing down the primacy of the Minimum Support Price (MSP) a couple of notches by scrapping bonuses.

The Government, through these Acts, has been quick to take away its protective umbrella and avoid dialogue, leaving farmers to inclement market weather.

In these Acts, there is neither mention of the MSP, nor a mechanism of price stability and guarantees to pre-empt farmers' exploitation by corporates. The Centre should ensure a level playing field for all with safeguards in place for small and medium farmers.

## Big shoes to fill in Bihar

If Chirag and Tejashwi are not able to benefit from the legacy of their fathers in the forthcoming Assembly elections, then who will?

Will the two young leaders of Bihar, Tejashwi Yadav of the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) and Chirag Paswan of the Lok Janshakti Party (LJP) be able to fill the big shoes of their fathers? Lalu Prasad and Ram Vilas Paswan had been players in Bihar politics for decades and held their own despite various ups and downs in their lives. They sensed a political opening in the late eighties to challenge the dominant Congress and succeeded to a certain extent. Now, years down the line, an ailing Lalu is in a jail in Ranchi, serving his sentence in the fodder scam while Paswan passed away recently.

Now, the two young leaders will be playing a much more pronounced role in Bihar politics. They are leading two important caste groups, the Yadavs and the Dalits in Bihar, estimated to be about 24-30 per cent of the electorate. To their advantage, their fathers declared both the young leaders as their political heirs long ago.

The 39-year-old Tejashwi Yadav is the leader of the Opposition alliance called the *Mahagathbandhan* (Grand Alliance). The Congress Party, the CPI, CPI-M and some smaller parties are part of the coalition. This *Mahagathbandhan* will be facing the ruling JD(U)-BJP alliance in the Assembly elections in the State.

Tejashwi is young, ambitious, articulate and has learnt some tricks of politics from his father. Once Lalu went to jail, he grabbed the opportunity and quickly moved to neutralise his opponents. However, Tejashwi has many challenges ahead. The first is to keep the flock together. Raghubansh Prasad Singh, a close confidant of Lalu, resigned as the party's vice-president and left the RJD just before his death last month. Senior leaders like Shivanand Tiwari and some MLAs are leaving the RJD and joining Nitish Kumar's camp. Though Tejashwi has inherited Lalu's name, his identity and political legacy, we have to see whether he inherits his father's vote bank, too. Lalu had carefully built up the Yadav-Muslim (MY) electorate. With his one action of halting BJP leader LK Advani's famous Rath Yatra in 1990, he has claimed secular credentials for all time to come. In all probability this vote bank will remain with Tejashwi.

Then there is the youth vote. There are four crore young voters who should be targeted by the two young leaders. Tejashwi has built up his social media platforms, posters, slogans and election jingles. Though he has studied only up to Class IX, he is also proficient in English. However, Tejashwi has a long way to go as he lacks the political shrewdness of Lalu.

Second, he has nothing much to show for his achievements as he was the Deputy Chief Minister only for 20 months. Third, Lalu overlooked the claims of his elder son Tej Prasad Yadav and daughter Misa Bharti and declared Tejashwi as his political heir, which has created jealousy and trouble in the family. Tejashwi has to sort this out and ensure his family's support. Fourth, Tejashwi got his position on a silver platter. He became the Deputy Chief Minister at the young age of 26 and is now waiting to become the Chief Minister. When the *Mahagathbandhan* ended in 2017, he became the Leader of the Opposition and now the leader of the Grand Alliance. Now is the time for him to show his leadership skills.

Chirag's story is different. He wanted to become a film actor but after failing to make an impact in Bollywood, joined his father in politics and soon rose to become the party chief. He has been involved in many crucial decisions of the party, including the recent decision to go solo in Bihar Assembly polls, leaving the Nitish-led NDA in Bihar.

Ram Vilas Paswan was known as a weathercock and he had worked with eight Prime Ministers, serving in their Cabinets for decades. His recent death would help Chirag in boosting the party but we will have to see how he translates the sympathy factor into votes. Chirag is yet to emerge as a new Dalit icon like his father. He will also face the challenge of galvanising the party workers and consolidate his position. He should be able to make his voters believe that he is the right person to fill the space left by his father.

In Bihar, Dalits comprise over 17 per cent of the population and they are one of the game-changers. While Paswan could keep his Dalit constituency intact by going "solo", Chirag will be allowing the LJP's rank and file to contest the election on a much bigger scale and expand its organisational footprint. Rumours say that he has also sealed a deal with the BJP for the post-election scenario. The two leaders will be facing a formidable combination of the JD(U) and the BJP, who have established leadership, experience, money power, muscle power and the electoral machinery at their beck and call. However, if Chirag and Tejashwi are not able to benefit from the legacy of their fathers, then who will? Could it be the JD(U) or the BJP or the Congress? Probably both might succeed in keeping their flock together if they play their cards well. Or else their voters might move away and then the playing field will be open to all.



# Why Taiwan irks China

Xi is being labelled as a revisionist and expansionist and the world is getting united to counter China's designs under democratic forces by supporting the Taiwanese cause

In an unprecedented move recently, the Chinese embassy in New Delhi issued a series of "directives" to Indian journalists and media houses regarding the coverage of the National Day of Taiwan on October 10. The press release that was issued by the media section of the embassy appeared to be more of a diktat and declared, "We will like to remind our media friends that there is only one China in the world, and the Government of the People's Republic of China is the sole legitimate Government representing the whole of China. Taiwan is an inalienable part of China's territory." It further dictated to the journalists, "Taiwan shall not be referred to as a country or Republic of China or the leader of China's Taiwan region as 'President', so as not to send wrong signals to the general public."

Significantly, no such "advisory" was issued by the Chinese embassy in 2019 on the Taiwanese National Day. What is even more infuriating is that after the event, it issued a statement on "mis-reporting by the Indian media on Taiwan", seriously objecting to and expressing strong dissatisfaction at some of the journalists referring to Taiwan as a country. "Taiwan is an inalienable part of China's territory. It is an objective fact and a universally recognised norm governing international relations," emphasised the Chinese envoy.

What was so different this year that the embassy issued a virtual threat to the Indian media? China is preparing for the celebration of the 100th year of the formation of the Communist Party of China (CCP) under the watchful eye of its all-powerful President Xi Jinping. The current behaviour of the Chinese diplomatic staff is the manifestation of its "wolf warrior" diplomacy. Xi wants China not only to be powerful but assertive as well. He is aggressively pushing China's "3 W Strategy", which includes media warfare. Xi desires that the CCP should not only control select foreign media but also be able to manipulate it to further its ideology and portray its Comprehensive National Power (CNP).

But why is China so sensitive about Taiwan? It is said that Taiwan would be the main trigger of a Sino-American conflict if it ever manifests. Ironically, the US does not officially recognise the Republic of China or Taiwan. Even India doesn't. Only 17 countries in the world recognise Taiwan. Yet, the US is the biggest arms supplier to Taiwan, its 11th-largest trading partner and avowed guarantor of its sovereignty.

The self-ruled island's uncertain future, amid tensions between Washington and a newly-powerful Beijing, is the greatest unresolved legacy of the Chinese civil war. While China claims Taiwan to be one of its regions and refers to it as Taiwan region, the latter is in no mood to alter the status quo and lose its status as an independent democratic nation. Xi has offered to resolve the matter on the pattern of Hong Kong by advocating the "One Nation, Two Systems" model, which has been rejected by the island nation.

Dwelling into history, the dispute is a legacy of the Mao-led Chinese civil war. The island formally became a Chinese province only in 1887. But China's faltering Qing imperial government was forced to cede it to Japan in 1895 after a brief war. Japan ran Taiwan as a colony until 1945, when it was effectively handed over to Chiang Kai-shek's Nationalist (KMT) Government in China. In 1949, Mao Zedong's forces won the Chinese civil war and the KMT fled to the island, ruling it under martial law until democratising it in the 1980s, while the Communists controlled

China. It continues to remain a dispute till date since no peace treaty has ever been signed.

However, China's official position on Taiwan is unambiguous. It claims that the latter is, was and always has been an inseparable part of it, and that international law supports such a claim. This is drilled into every mainland Chinese child's mind as part of the CCP's ideology campaign with no second thought on the issue and no public discussion of alternate views being permitted.

The CCP wants outright reunification, the sooner the better, seeing the recovery of the island as the final chapter in the civil war and end of past humiliations when China was forced to cede territory to foreigners. Xi has succeeded in reasserting party control over society, which had loosened to an extent during the era of his immediate predecessors who believed in "collective leadership."

His clarion call to the nation after assuming its control was, "Don't forget the original intention. Stick to the mission." With multifarious threats challenging him, the slogan has become more relevant in the present days and is emerging as a battle cry for unity and perseverance. With increasing US interference in Taiwan and the non-reconciliatory approach of its newly-elected hardliner President, iron lady Tsai Ing-wen, China is becoming increasingly sensitive and restive about Taiwan. On the other hand, Taiwan is becoming more assertive and confident.

During the ongoing pandemic, the Taiwanese were denied entry into various countries which believed them to be Chinese since their passport is of the Republic of China. The Taiwanese Government has, therefore, decided to change the cover of its citizens' passports

to read "Taiwan Passport" while retaining the Republic of China in Mandarin.

It has its own currency, the New Taiwan dollar controlled by the central bank of the Republic of China. It is increasingly stamping Taiwanese made goods as "Made in Taiwan" and all this is not going down well with the CCP, which is increasingly threatening to punish the errant island nation. China is also worried and annoyed with the fact that more and more nations are speaking up for Taiwan and are reluctant to back down under Chinese pressure.

Xi is being labelled as a revisionist and expansionist and the world is getting united to counter his designs under the banner of democratic forces and supporting the Taiwanese cause. There are growing voices in India for recognition of Taiwan though that may not be easy due to the prevailing agreements and treaties with Beijing. However, a change in intent and desire to strengthen relations between the two countries has been signalled by the present regime by deputing two of its senior party leaders to attend the swearing-in ceremony of the new President.

The CCP is unwilling to settle for anything less than reunification. For Xi it has an additional emotional angle as well, related to his family history. China regards Taiwan as unfinished business as part of the civil war and Xi is a firm believer of this historic mission.

Apart from being an unfinished mission of the civil war, it is the geo strategic location and buzzing high-tech micro-chip industry of Taiwan that is the compelling reason for China to claim ownership of the island territory. Taiwan is also the world's 22nd largest economy and an important supply chain link of Silicon Valley. Many high-tech companies from the mainland have

changed base to the island territory with Taiwan emerging as a potential high-tech superpower. It is home to the world's biggest contract chipmaker, Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Limited.

Taiwan's location and economy are critical to China in its pursuance of becoming the *numero uno* world power. If Taiwan becomes integral to China as desired by the latter, it would become a Pacific power, strengthen its position in the South China Sea and be in a position to threaten vital US interests in the Pacific region. It would also have the leverage to cut off oil supplies to Japan and South Korea, important US allies in the region. Economically, Beijing would have control over the world's major cutting-edge technologies. All this explains China's sensitivities about Taiwan and its allergy to other nations calling it a "country" rather than Taiwan, Region of the People's Republic of China. The US, on the other hand, does not want to take any chance in the security of the island-nation that may help China fulfil its mission. Stepped-up US support for Taiwan has angered China, which has often cautioned Washington DC that it amounts to US support for Taiwan's independence. If it feels threatened enough, Beijing may forcibly occupy the island by launching military operations across the strait.

With India and China on the verge of war in eastern Ladakh and the heightened anti-China sentiments across the country, the Chinese were apprehensive of the Indian media giving prominence to Taiwan on its National Day. It was to pre-empt the same and gauge India's concerns to its sensitivities that the advisory was issued by the Chinese embassy.

# Give MSMEs a competitive edge through IT infra

If we want to develop the 'Made in India' brand and compete globally, we have to upgrade all systems of manufacturing and services

Knowledge is the key to success. This has been proved time and again by the achievements of start-ups. In almost all fields, new businesses have not only challenged market leaders but also undercut them. Unicorns like Paytm, PhonePe, Flipkart, Netmeds, MakeMyTrip, OYO did not create a new market but rearranged the existing one and became leaders. A similar approach is needed in the manufacturing sector if we are keen to take on the world and are dreaming of becoming a \$5 trillion economy.

The Micro, Small and Medium

Enterprises (MSME) sector is key to the Indian economy as it is one of the biggest job generators. It has also created resilience to withstand global economic shocks and turmoil. With around 63.4 million units throughout India, MSMEs contribute to around 6.11 per cent of the manufacturing Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and 24.63 per cent of the GDP from service activities, as well as 33.4 per cent of the manufacturing output. Their export share is 40 per cent. The MSME sector is the second-largest employer after agriculture, giving jobs to more than 120 million people in rural areas. MSMEs are now contributing close to 15 per cent to the overall GDP of India.

If the Government wants to support MSMEs and equip them to meet global standards — as in the current scenario we are not only working to "Make in India" but also trying to "Make for the World" — we need to upgrade them in all aspects: Infrastructure, technology, manpower and capital. Plus, in addition to finan-



cial and logistics support, MSMEs need information technology (IT) support to upgrade themselves. They can be carriers of knowledge and experience and create a repository for others.

To match international standards and compete globally, upgraded IT infrastructure is needed for MSMEs and if the same is provided by the Government free or at reduced costs, then it will take a huge financial and operational burden off small entities.

In the current scenario, skilled manpower will be a challenge for MSMEs and with shared IT support,

they can reduce their dependence on internal staff. Another big challenge in front of MSMEs will be limited budgets for upgradation of their existing IT infrastructure and affordability of operating costs. The requirement of research and development in MSMEs is different from that of big industries as they need cost and resource efficient solutions. MSMEs need continuous upgradation to compete globally and benchmarking is required so that they can produce world-class goods. Big industry players, who are cash-rich, always upgrade by deploying huge capital and beat small competitors like MSMEs.

By introducing shared IT infrastructure from the Government's side, MSMEs can save on capital expenditure and operating costs, giving them better profitability. Owing to the nature of their business and size, most MSMEs don't use a high level of IT support and lack badly in IT infrastructure. As these are promoter/owner-driven and focus more on their core job, their investment

in core job IT and research is always lacking.

For example, a small auto-component manufacturer requires designing software to improvise designs or to reduce cost. New software could cost the business ₹5-8 lakh, which is unaffordable for most. By using shared IT services, the manufacturer can improve the design, control quality and deliver a better product under stringent cost control. Such a requirement can be very diverse, starting from basic software, communication or meeting tools to highly-advanced Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) solutions. It can be designed or categorised based on the requirement level or reach and can be priced accordingly. The biggest strength of MSMEs is their agility and ease of response to change as per the client's requirement. If the same is supported by IT and other high technology, they can be a double engine of growth for India.

This can be designed on a PPP model and create employment for ser-

vice providers too. Post the pandemic, the Government is budgeting huge growth in the MSME sector and planning multiple packages for them. IT is a consistent requirement and always looking for upgradation. Hence if the Government can provide IT infrastructure resources at a nominal fee or free of cost, then it will be a huge saving for MSMEs. On the other hand, due to the bulk purchase of such services, their total outgo will be considerably lower as compared to individual purchase.

If we want to develop the "Made in India" brand as a global signature and beat competition around the world, we have to upgrade all systems of manufacturing and service. This can only be done after improving the IT infrastructure. This one-point cost will save and support millions who are looking to grow and make India a manufacturing and services hub.

# ‘WH moves forward on arms sale to Taiwan’

**Washington:** The White House is moving forward with three sales of advanced weaponry to Taiwan, sending in recent days a notification of the deals to Congress for approval, five sources said on Monday, while China threatened retaliation.

The move in the run-up to the Nov. 3 U.S. election, first reported by Reuters, is likely to anger China, which considers Taiwan a wayward province that it has vowed to reunite with the mainland, by force if necessary.

Reuters broke the news in September that as many as seven major weapons systems were making their way through the U.S. export process as the Trump administration ramps up pressure on China.

Leaders of the Senate Foreign Relations and House of Representatives Foreign Affairs committees were notified that three of the planned weapons sales had been approved by the U.S. State Department which oversees foreign military sales, said the sources, who are familiar with the situation but declined to be identified.

The informal notifications were for a truck-based rocket launcher made by Lockheed Martin Corp called a High Mobility Artillery Rocket System (HIMARS), long-range



air-to-ground missiles made by Boeing Co called SLAM-ER, and external sensor pods for F-16 jets that allow the real-time transmission of imagery and data from the aircraft back to ground stations.

Notifications for the sale of other weapons systems, including large, sophisticated aerial drones, land-based Harpoon anti-ship missiles and underwater mines, to deter amphibious landings, have yet to reach Capitol Hill, but these were expected soon, the sources said.

A State Department spokesman said: “As a matter of

policy, the United States does not confirm or comment on proposed defense sales or transfers until they are formally notified to Congress.”

Chinese foreign ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian said U.S. arms sales to Taiwan severely damaged China’s sovereignty and security interests, urging Washington to clearly recognize the harm they caused and immediately cancel them.

“China will make a legitimate and necessary response according to how the situation develops,” Zhao told reporters in Beijing, without elaborating. **AP**

## Taiwan denies China spying accusations

**Taipei:** Taiwan on Tuesday dismissed new spying allegations by China as a further attempt to smear the government of the self-governing island democracy that Beijing claims as its own territory.

The remarks follow a report on Monday night by Chinese broadcaster CCTV featuring a taped confession from a man identified as Cheng Yu-chin, the second such report in as many days.

On Sunday, CCTV broadcast a confession by a man identified as Li Mengju, whose name is also spelled Lee Meng-chu, who like Cheng said he had been working to destabilise China and harm the ruling Communist Party’s reputation.

In the same report, CCTV said security personnel had solved more than 100 spying cases as part of an initiative dubbed Operation Thunder 2020.

Taiwanese Premier Su Tseng-chang called the accusations an attempt by Beijing to “defame and create fear,” while the foreign ministry’s head of European affairs, Johnson Chiang, called the allegations “pure defamation and calumny.” CCTV’s airing of videoed confessions have prompted lawsuits abroad amid accusations that the accounts were coerced and that the broadcaster is merely a propaganda arm of the Communist Party. **AP**

## Germany: Solidarity with Greece, Cyprus in Turkey dispute

**Berlin:** Germany’s foreign minister headed Tuesday to Greece and Cyprus, pledging “full solidarity” with them in their dispute with Turkey over sea boundaries and drilling rights in the eastern Mediterranean.

Germany holds the rotating European Union presidency and before departing Berlin, Foreign Minister Heiko Maas said Greece and Cyprus had both German and EU backing but urged an “honest effort on all sides” to find a solution.

Greece on Monday accused neighbour Turkey of undermining efforts to ease a crisis over eastern Mediterranean drilling rights, after Ankara redeployed a survey vessel for new energy exploration in disputed waters — including an area very close to a secluded Greek island.

The move reignited tensions over sea boundaries between Greek islands, Cyprus and Turkey’s southern coast, which had flared up over the

summer, prompting a military build-up, bellicose rhetoric and fears of a confrontation between the two NATO members and historic regional rivals.

The Turkish search vessel, Oruc Reis, left the port of Antalya on Monday for a mission expected to end October 22. Maas stressed that talks between the nations can only work in a “constructive atmosphere” and appealed “to Turkey not to close the window for dia-

logue that has just opened with Greece through unilateral measures.”

“Ankara must stop alternating between relaxation and provocation if the government is interested in talks, as it has repeatedly said,” he said.

Renewed Turkish gas exploration in the disputed areas would be “a major setback to efforts to de-escalate and thus also for the further development of EU-Turkey relations,” Maas said. **AP**

## Japan protests to China for entering Japanese waters

**Tokyo:** Tokyo has lodged protests to Beijing over the entry of Chinese coast guard ships into Japan’s territorial waters off disputed East China Sea islands and their refusal to move out for a third day on Tuesday, Japanese officials said.

The two Chinese ships entered the Japanese-claimed waters Sunday morning, appearing to approach a Japanese fishing boat carrying three crew members. They have remained there, while ignoring repeated warnings and exit demands by the Japanese side, Japanese coast guard officials said.

Chinese coast guard vessels routinely violate territorial waters around the Japanese-controlled southern islands of Senkaku, which China calls Diaoyu and also claims.

Chief Cabinet Secretary Katsunobu Kato said Tuesday that it was “extremely regrettable” that the two Chinese coast guard ships were still in Japanese waters.

Japan “strictly protested” to the Chinese side and demanded that the Chinese ships immediately move out of Japanese waters, Kato said.

He said Japan would firmly defend its territorial waters, land and airspace “with a sense of urgency.” Japanese coast guard officials said the fishing boat with the three crew members was safely protected, but declined to give any other details.

The Japanese government says Japan has had ownership of the islands since the late 1890s under international law. Tokyo also says Beijing started claiming its ownership around 1970 when possible undersea oil deposits near the islands were reported.

Japan sees China’s military development and increasingly assertive stance in the East and South China seas as a major security threat.

Japan’s military invasion of China in the 1930s and 1940s remains a sore spot between the two sides. **AP**

## Malaysia’s Anwar meets king in bid to form new Govt

**Kuala Lumpur:** Malaysian opposition leader Anwar Ibrahim said he presented the nation’s king on Tuesday with evidence that he has enough support among lawmakers to topple the prime minister and form a new government, an assertion the palace denied.

Anwar said he presented the monarch with evidence of the support he has from over 120 lawmakers, which would allow him to unseat Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin.

Anwar said the monarch pledged to abide by the constitution, and would consult leaders from other parties before making a decision. He declined to give details, urging Malaysians to be patient and give the king space to review the evidence.

“These documents made it abundantly clear that we have registered a formidable and convincing majority among parliamentarians,” Anwar told a news conference after the royal meeting.

“Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin has lost his majority and therefore, it would be appropriate for him to resign.”

After that news conference, however, the palace released a statement denying that Anwar provided evidence of support. It said Anwar only told Sultan Abdullah Sultan Ahmad Shah how many lawmakers supported him but didn’t reveal their identities.

It said the king advised Anwar “to abide by and respect the legal process” based on the constitution.

Muhyiddin, who took power in March after securing enough support in Parliament to unseat Anwar’s reformist alliance, has previously dismissed Anwar’s claim to a majority.

Muhyiddin currently boasts a slim two-seat majority in the 222-seat Parliament and has been grappling to maintain support amid infighting in his coalition. **AP**

## China FM calls US Indo-Pacific strategy a huge security risk

The United States poses a “huge security risk” to Asia by pushing to boost engagement with the region, China’s foreign minister said Tuesday during a tour of Southeast Asia, where Beijing and

Washington are locked in a battle for influence.

Speaking in Malaysia, Wang Yi said the US’s real aim is “to build an Indo-Pacific NATO,” in a strategy he said harkened back to the Cold War. Washington is trying to “stir up confrontation among

different groups and blocs, and stir up geopolitical competition while maintaining the pre-dominance and hegemony system of the US,” Wang said at a joint news conference with his Malaysian counterpart, Hishammuddin Hussein.

“In this sense, this strategy

itself is a huge security risk,” Wang said.

Wang also urged Southeast Asian nations, which are aiming to draw up a code of conduct with China in the South China Sea, to remove “external disruption” in the disputed waters, but did not elaborate.

### DON’T RECOGNISE LADAKH...

He made these remarks when asked to react to the series of bridges inaugurated in India, including eight in Ladakh and eight in Arunachal Pradesh. “First I want to make it clear that China does not recognise the Ladakh Union Territory illegally set up by the Indian side and Arunachal Pradesh. We stand against the development of infrastructure facilities aimed at military contention along the border area,” said the Chinese spokesperson.

“Based on consensus, neither should take actions along the border that might escalate the situation that is to avoid undermining the efforts by the two sides to ease the situation.” He also said the Indian side “ramping up infrastructure development along the border and stepping up military deployment is the root cause for the tensions between the two sides.”

“We urge the Indian side to earnestly implement our consensus and refrain from actions that might escalate the situation and take concrete measures to safeguard peace and tranquility along the border,” said Zhao.

In fact, the stand-offs began in early May in the Galwan valley after a Chinese patrol obstructed an Indian patrol claiming that India was building the 270-km long road there in disputed area. India strongly rejected the Chinese allegation and said the bridge and roads were well within its own territory.

China is rattled by rapid improvement in infrastructure projects in Ladakh and other regions near the LAC in eastern region. These projects including roads and bridges will facilitate faster movement of troops and weapons closer to the border, officials said. Dedicating the bridges to the nation, Rajnath had said after Pakistan, China is also creating a dispute at the border with India as if it was part of a “mission.” You are well aware of the conditions created along our northern and eastern borders. First it was Pakistan, and now also by China, as if a border dispute is being created under a mission. We have a border of about 7,000 km with these countries where the tension continues,” the Minister said. The bridges inaugurated by him included 10 in Jammu & Kashmir, eight in Ladakh, two in Himachal Pradesh, four each in Punjab and Sikkim and eight each in Uttarakhand and Arunachal Pradesh.

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar during his visit to Beijing last year, had conveyed to his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi that there was no implication of the change “for either the external boundaries of India or the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China. India was not raising any additional territorial claims.” This reiteration was made after abrogation of Article 370 giving special status to Jammu & Kashmir. Jaishankar had also said, “The legislative measures were aimed at promoting better governance and socio-economic development,” he had said.

### SHAHJAHANPUR LAW STUDENT TURNS HOSTILE

The Allahabad high court had on February 3, 2020 transferred the trial from Shahjahanpur to the Lucknow’s MP-MLA court.

The case first came to light after the woman went missing on August 24, a day after she posted a video on social media alleging that a “senior leader of the sant community” was harassing and threatening to kill her.

Her father filed a complaint with police, accusing Chinmayanand of sexually harassing her, a charge refuted by the former Union minister’s lawyer who claimed it was a “conspiracy” to blackmail him.

An SIT was constituted by the Uttar Pradesh government on the orders of the Supreme Court in September to investigate the charges levelled by the woman.

The law student was also later charged with trying to extort money from Chinmayanand. The 23-year-old woman and her three friends were booked on Chinmayanand’s complaint that they had demanded Rs 5 crore from him.

The former Union minister alleged that they had threatened to make public video clips that showed him getting massages from the student. She was, however, granted bail in December.

The Supreme Court had last week set aside an Allahabad High Court order allowing Chinmayanand to get a copy of statement of the woman recorded before a magistrate in connection with the case against him, saying “utmost confidentiality is required to be maintained” in sexual exploitation cases.

### CBI VISITS CRIME SPOT IN HATHRAS

The Uttar Pradesh Police had registered a case of attempt to murder on a statement by the victim’s brother who, as per the FIR at Chandpa police station, had stated that the accused tried to strangle his sister in a millet field and escaped when she raised an alarm. A notification issued by the Centre at the behest of the State Government directed the CBI to probe, rape, murder and atrocity and “any attempt, abetment and/or conspiracy, in relation to or in connection with such offence(s) and/or for any other offence committed in the course of the same transaction or arising out of the same facts.”

“The complainant had alleged that on September 14, 2020 the accused tried to strangle his sister in the millet field. The

case has been registered by CBI on the request of the Uttar Pradesh Government and further notification from Government of India,” the CBI had said in a statement after registration of the FIR on Sunday.

and Justice Rajan Roy reminded the officials about the definition of rape.

The court also directed the state government to lay down modalities for cremation in Hathras-like situations.

The 11-page order, dated Monday, was uploaded Tuesday on the high court website.

The 19-year-old Dalit woman died at a Delhi hospital a fortnight after her alleged rape by four men from her village in Hathras district on September 14.

She was cremated in the middle of the night in her village. Family members claimed that the cremation, which took place well past midnight, was without their consent and they were not allowed to bring home the body one last time.

The hurried cremation fuelled further outrage over the incident and the high court directed senior officials as well as the victim’s family to appear before it on Monday.

The next hearing in the case is on November 2, when the suspended Hathras Superintendent of Police Vikrant Vir has also been asked to appear in court.

The court said the cremation without following rituals violated the victim’s human rights as well as those of her family and relatives.

The administration had argued that the cremation took place in a hurried manner because it feared law and order problems. But the court was not satisfied with the district magistrate’s explanation.

We do not find any good reason on behalf of the administration as to why they could not hand over the body to the family members for some time, say for even half an hour, to enable them to perform their rituals at home and thereafter to cremate it either in the night or the next day,” the bench observed.

The court questioned the state government’s action only against the then SP and not the DM. SP Vikrant Vir was first transferred out and then suspended.

The court ordered that the probe by a Special Investigation Team or the Central Bureau of Investigation should be kept confidential and not leaked out.

It took note of statements which are “affecting and influencing” the investigation. The bench said officers not directly connected with the investigation should not make any statement in public on the offence as it could lead to unnecessary speculation among people who may not be aware of the niceties of law.

The order also cautioned the “over-jovous” media.

Without intending to interfere with the right of freedom of expression, we request the media as also the political parties to air their views in a manner which does not disturb social harmony and/or infringe upon rights of the victim’s family and that of the accused.

No one should indulge in character assassination of the victim, just as the accused, should not be pronounced guilty

before a fair trial. The investigating agency and the courts should be allowed to determine these issues, the bench said.

The HC directed the state government to provide adequate security to the victim’s family and ensure that no harm is done to them.

### MEHBOOBA RELEASED FROM PSA DETENTION

“I’m pleased to hear that Mehbooba Mufti Sahiba has been released after more than a year in detention. Her continued detention was a travesty and was against the basic tenets of democracy. Welcome out Mehbooba”, Omar Abdullah tweeted.

### FARM EXPERTS PRAISE CENTRE FOR LAWS ...

Echoing similar sentiments, chairman of Punjab-based Green Valley Farms RPS Gandhi said there are enormous benefits of the new farm-related legislation but the farmers need to be made aware and educated about it. He said talking to the farmers in their own language is important so that there is no confusion about these three Bills.

“These Acts give freedom to farmers to sell their produce anywhere. They can sell it even at small mandis, set up by Farmer Producer Orgs (FPOs) and can get a good rate without paying mandi fee,” Sanjeev Chadha, MD, National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India Ltd said.

National Seed Association of India (NSAI) president M Prabhakar Rao said the farm laws will boost the development of seed industry. It will benefit lakhs of farmers involved in the seed industry, they are happy with the decision.

Chairman of Indian Chamber of Food and Agriculture M J Khan who was present in all the meetings held so far said in a way it is a dialogue process between farmers, key stakeholders in the agriculture sector and the Centre to clear any apprehensions and misgivings about the farm bills. The meetings with a number of stakeholders in the agriculture sector are being held at Singh’s residence.

In his meeting with scientists, professors and senior professionals from the farm sector, Puri said the reforms will even benefit “arthiyas” (commission agents) and also asserted that the MSP regime will stay.

made by the Governor that several delegations had met him during the last three months and demanded the re-opening of places in the State, Uddhav wrote: “You have mentioned that several delegations called on

you during the last three months to demand re-opening of places of worship. But, all the three memorandums that you have attached along with your letter are submitted by the BJP and its supporters. My Government has taken serious note of your letter and decision will be taken as early as possible after taking due precautions”.

In response to the Governor’s references to his reported comment made on June 1 (when the latter embarked on “Mission Beginning Again”) that he had dumped the word “lockdown” and the statement that the Chief Minister’s statement raised much hope in the minds of the people, Uddhav wrote in the initial part of his letter: “I received your letter asking to reopen all places of worship. My Government is thinking about this. As much we take into account the sentiments and faith of the people, it is our primary responsibility to take care of the lives of the people”.

“While fighting a battle against Covid-19, it is as much wrong to impose lockdown all of a sudden, it is equally improper the lockdown at one go. At this juncture, my Government is in the midst of implementing “My family, my responsibility” drive in the State. Under the drive, we are issuing health advisories, creating awareness, conducting medical examinations and wherever necessary we conducting Covid-19 tests and our health machinery teams are visiting each and every house across. We are perhaps the first State in the country to be undertaking such door-to-door visits,” he said.

Meanwhile, in his letter to the Prime Minister seeking the latter’s intervention to the questionable contents of the letter written by the Governor to the Chief Minister, Pawar said that Koshiyari could have “independent views and opinion on the issue” and that he also appreciated the prerogative of the Governor to convey his views to the Chief Minister. “However, I am shocked and surprised to see the letter of the Governor released to the media and the kind of language used in it,” the NCP chief said.

Taking serious exception to the “intemperate” language used invocation of the word “secular” by the Governor in his letter to the Chief Minister, Pawar said: “In the very Preamble of our Constitution, the word ‘Secular’ is added that equates and shields all religions, and hence the chair of the Chief Minister must uphold such tenets of the Constitution. Unfortunately, Hon Governor’s letter invokes the connotation as if it is written to the leader of a political party”.

Pawar said that in a democracy, he believes a free exchange of views should take place between the Governor and the Chief Minister. “However, the tone and tenor used must always be keeping with the stature of the constitutional post occupied by the individuals. Looking at the turn of events the Chief Minister was left with no option but to release the letter to Hon Governor to the press. I fully endorse the decision of the Hon Chief minister on the issue,” the NCP chief said.

Congress State president and Revenue Minister Balasaheb Thorat also hit out at the Governor saying that the language used by the latter in his letter to the Chief Minister was against the Constitution.

“Moreover, a similar situation is there even in Goa, then why the Governor has not issued such a letter to reopen the places of worship there,” Thorat said.

## SC to pass orders in Prajapati’s case on Oct 15

**New Delhi (PTI):** The Supreme Court on Tuesday said that it would pass orders on October 15 on a plea of Uttar Pradesh government challenging the interim bail of two months granted to gang rape accused and former state minister Gayatri Prasad Prajapati on medical grounds by the Allahabad High Court.

The verdict was reserved by a bench of Justices Ashok Bhushan, R Subhash Reddy and MR Shah which heard the arguments of Additional Solicitor General ASV Raju on behalf of the Uttar Pradesh government and senior advocate Rajeev Dhavan, who represented Prajapati.

Prajapati, who was a minister in the erstwhile Samajwadi Party government, along with others, is accused of raping a woman and attempting to molest her minor daughter.

At the outset, Raju read out Prajapati’s medical report and said that the medical board had stated that he can be treated in the jail itself.

He said that Prajapati has been in jail for months and his condition is said to be stable. Raju added that Prajapati requires no hospitalization for his treatment.

The bench also inquired about the regular bail of the accused and the law officer said it is still pending.

Senior advocate Rajeev Dhavan, appearing for Prajapati, said that his regular bail has not been decided since May last year and the high court has restrained itself from deciding his applications, as this case was pending.

Inhuman treatment in jail and threat to a person’s health are the grounds which cannot be overlooked in the matter, he said, adding that his eight medical reports shows that he is ill, diabetic and suffering from other ailments.

The bench said it is reserving order in the matter and would pronounce its verdict on October 15.

On September 21, the top court had stayed Prajapati’s interim bail, granted for two months on medical grounds by the High Court.

The Lucknow bench of the Allahabad High Court on September 3 had granted the interim bail to Prajapati but he remained in judicial custody as a fresh case of fraud, forgery and criminal intimidation was registered against him.

# Efficiency is key

An important component for building an education system that creates employable candidates is to first define the parameters of employability, which need to be valid in entry level jobs, says DR AKHIL SHAHANI

According to studies conducted across various sectors in India, a majority of recruiters do not deem most graduates as employable. As the nation grapples with an economic slowdown and employment crunch in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic, it is incumbent upon us to introspect on the reasons.

Upon further questioning, it was found that recruiters had contrasting definitions of an employable candidate. While some preferred a self-sufficient employee requiring minimal supervision, others looked for tenacity and ambition. Still others search for multitaskers or polyglots. However, while these definitions indicate certain attributes of a candidate's personality, they fail to identify and actually define what recruiters need. This lack of a common framework for defining employability creates a conundrum not only for students searching for these jobs, but also for educational institutions around the world that are expected to create employable graduates.

Another gaping issue is the flawed system used in the hiring of candidates. More often than not, companies delegate the responsibilities of a recruitment firm to junior level employees, who are left with a large number of resumes to sift through as well as interview potential candidates. These interviews



mostly comprise of some standard questions, with the candidate doling out pre-rehearsed answers. Since most colleges prepare their students to clear such interviews, the true employability of a candidate may not be determined until after they are hired. It is no wonder that almost 60 per cent of new entry-level hires do not work out as expected once they join the company.

A key component for building an education system that creates employable candidates is to first define the parameters of employability, which need to be valid in entry level jobs across most industries.

Research across a large number of surveys of employers has determined that the most commonly cited

employability traits include:

- **Strong communication skills:** to understand others and convey a point of view effectively
- **Good teamworking ability:** to collaborate with peers to achieve company goals
- **An aptitude for solving problems:** to face new challenges and overcome them
- **Proactivity:** to work without needing constant supervision
- **Professional work ethic:** to deliver what was promised on time

Interestingly, most employers do not want a creative, highly intelligent candidate. Instead they look for employees who can understand the needs of the organisation and their superiors, and deliver efficiently. This

is a relatively simple ask and it would be easy for universities to develop an education model that hones these traits.

Faculty, thus, need to make a shift from giving lectures, a one-way communication method, to becoming facilitators for self-discovery, which involves two-way communication and engages students in the quest for new knowledge and skills. Pedagogical innovations already exist, that can aid in this, such as problem-based learning where students work individually or in teams to solve challenges set by their teacher; flipped classrooms where students study the course material before coming to class; case studies or simulations which involve the application of the knowledge learned; and work-study assignments where students intern at a real company and implement a project.

Peter Drucker said: "What gets measured, gets managed". If recruiters and universities could find common ground for defining what makes an employable candidate, they will be able to devise a robust framework to enable the development of a skilled workforce that can match the requirements of the industry and help them achieve organisational goals successfully.

The OSHWC Code, on a cursory reading, appears to be gender-neutral. The definition of "workers" mentions "persons", sans gender. However, even though the language doesn't show a gender bias, the lack of special consideration for women workers, especially migrant women workers shows that the Code lacks gender inclusivity and equity.

While the Ministry of Labour and Employment told the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Labour that they would "protect the interests of women workers in every industry/establishment and provide safety for them", the OSHWC Code in its current form fails to do so. Systemic sexual violence and exploitation of women — especially in the informal sector (such as brick kilns, construction, factories) — is rampant and under-reported. But the Code does not recognise this backdrop of a strong, existing work-place culture of misogyny and sexism. In fact, it leaves out a large number of women migrant workers who are engaged in the informal sector — e.g. domestic workers, daily wage labourers, etc.

"It's also important to note that while laws exist to protect women from sexual harassment at the workplace, no laws make the process of migration to the workplace safer for women. Women, who migrate for work by themselves or with families, have often reported facing physical and sexual violence during migration. This absence, in a legislation claiming to affirm migrant workers' rights, is glaring," Mishra Varma, a Communications, Policy and Public Affairs Professional, a creative writer, and an ex-journalist, tells you.

A great gap is that women's protections against criminal activities and intent at the work-site are neither stated explicitly nor guaranteed.

The Code also needs to be amended to link with existing provisions and laws in our Constitution and the Indian Penal Code which ensure affirmative action for women workers. This can guarantee protections for them against discrimination on the basis of gender, class, and caste. Additionally, agents, employers, contractors and Government authorities must ensure zero tolerance for such instances at the worksite and during migration for women workers, and should be held accountable.

While there is a chapter on women workers' rights, it falls woefully short in addressing the systemic issues women face at the workplace. In fact, the Code prohibits women from working a job if the appropriate Government considers that work "too dangerous", but does not define "too dangerous".

This is extremely discriminatory and prejudicial, and equivalent to prohibiting mobility and migration of women due to their vulnerability to physical and sexual violence, instead of addressing the factors that make them vulnerable. It also raises the question — why, if a work is "too dangerous", are men expected to per-

form it, while women are asked to stay away from it? It would be far more inclusive and effective for the Code to direct appropriate authorities to provide resources and equipment to make workplaces less dangerous, instead of keeping women workers away from work.

"Further, special provisions prescribed for women in the Code are valid only for workplaces that employ at least 10 workers. In effect, a workplace with nine employees would be exempt from giving these special provisions to women workers. Therefore, the Code needs to lower this threshold for all provisions that offer protection to the most vulnerable workers. The Code must also ensure protective measures are applicable to all workplaces, including the period of migration for workers to reach the work-site," Pompi Banerjee, a psychologist, researcher and human rights activist, and a member of Sanjog, says.

The Code also makes the right of women to work night-shifts (in mines, factories, plantations and beedi/cigar units) subject to conditions prescribed by the appropriate Government, including for safety measures, holidays, and working hours. This makes the right of women to work night-shifts extremely vague and altogether dependent on the whim of the authorities.

Sections that make women's work conditional need to be done away with in the Code. State Governments also need to draft rules that actively encourage women to work across shifts and industries, while guaranteeing their person adequate protections.

This biodegradable food wrapper has an in-built anti-bacterial compound and is safe for consumption. Professor Mukesh Doble, Department of Biotechnology, IIT Madras, said: "Our idea is to design a food wrap that will address two major issues, namely Solid Waste and Food Contamination during

storage due to bacterial growth. We have developed a biodegradable wrapping material with in-built antibacterial activity to prevent bacterial growth in stored food. The antibacterial compound should be safe for consumption as it is approved by the authorities and does not cause any toxicity."



Jos Buttler produced a superb 44-ball 70 against Mumbai Indians but didn't capitalise on the starts in the last two matches.

In fact, if it wasn't for Rahul Tewatia, the Royals would still be in the dumps.

The all-rounder, who had blasted five sixes against Kings XI Punjab, once again rescued RR with a 28-ball 45 in their last game against Sunrisers.

Delhi, on the other hand, were brought down by Mumbai Indians in their last game and Shreyas Iyer's men will look to shrug off the odd defeat and get back to the top with a professional display.

The Capitals possess an explosive batting department as well as a formidable bowling unit with Kagiso Rabada emerging as the best bowler this season, snaring 17 wickets so far.

He has been supported well by fellow South African pacer Anrich Nortje (8 wickets) and Harshal Patel.

Ravichandran Ashwin too has bowled well in the power-play and along with Axar Patel, has done well to suffocate the opposition teams.

However, it was Marcus Stoinis, whose all-round show floored RR in their last face-off and Smith would hope that his side has his match in Stokes.

In bowling, Jofra Archer has led the charge for RR. He, along with the spin duo of Tewatia and Shreyas Gopal, have consistently figured in the XI, which has gone through a lot of chopping and changing.

For DC, Shikhar Dhawan's return to form further boosts their batting order, featuring Prithvi Shaw and Iyer in the top four.

# MUCH-NEEDED WIN FOR CSK

A desperate Chennai Super Kings dished out an all-round performance to earn a much-needed win as they stay afloat in the race for the IPL Play-offs with a 20-run victory over Sunrisers Hyderabad, here on Tuesday.

Shane Watson and Ambati Rayudu shared a 81-run stand to power Chennai Super Kings to 167 for six after electing to bat.

CSK skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni then used seven bowlers, who executed their plans to perfection, to restrict SRH to 147 for eight.

With 57 off 39 balls, Kane Williamson was the top scorer for Sunrisers. He hit seven fours to keep his side in hunt but the steep required run-rate made it tough for SRH after the fall of the Kiwi batsman.

For CSK, the win, their third of the tournament, comes after two back-to-back losses. They now have six points and are placed sixth in the points table. While Sunrisers remain in the fifth spot.

Sunrisers were struck with twin blows in the fourth over with opener David Warner (9) and Mainsh Pandey (4) getting out, but Jonny Bairstow (23 off 24) and Williamson took them to 40 for two in the Powerplay overs.

Sunrisers' problems amplified when Ravindra Jadeja removed the dangerous Bairstow with the team struggling at 60 for three at the halfway stage.

With Priyam Garg (16) by his side, Williamson kept the scoreboard ticking with Sunrisers needing 75 off 36 balls.

But as soon as Sunrisers looked to get back

into the chase the youngster was caught at deep midwicket by Jadeja off a Karn Sharma delivery in the 15th over.

Vijay Shankar (12) didn't last long as the New Zealand skipper looked helplessly from the other end.

With the pressure mounting, Williamson had no option but to go for the big shot resulting in him being caught at long-on. Rashid Khan contributed with an eight-ball 14 in a lost cause.

Dwayne Bravo (2/25), Karn Sharma (2/37) picked two wickets each while with Sam Curran (1/18), Jadeja (1/21), Shardul Thakur (1/10) claimed one wicket each.

Earlier, Watson's 42 off 38 balls was studded with one four and three maximums, while Rayudu's hit three boundaries and two sixes in his 34-ball 41-run knock.

Jadeja (25 not out) and Dhoni (21 off 13 balls) played quick cameos smashing a total of five fours and two sixes between them in a stand of 32 in just 2.4 overs.

SRH bowlers did a commendable job, claiming four wickets for 47 runs in the last six overs. Sandeep Sharma (2/19), Khaleel Ahmed (2/45) and T Natarajan (2/41) picked two wickets apiece.

Desperate to snap their two-match losing streak, CSK elected to bat. The three-time champions sent young England all-rounder

Sam Curran instead of Watson to open the innings with Faf du Plessis. Sharma drew first blood for the Sunrisers, removing du Plessis in the beginning of the third over. The South African sneaked one to Jonny Bairstow off the very first ball he faced for a golden duck.

Curran was off to a bright start, smashing Ahmed for the first boundary of the match in the second over. He continued his onslaught on the pacer by hitting him two fours and as many sixes in the fourth over, quickly racing to 31 off 21-balls.

But Curran's time in the middle was brought to an end by Sharma, who went around the wicket to bowl a good length delivery angled into the leg stump. CSK ended the powerplay at 44/2 with both openers back in the dugout.

With pacer Sandeep Sharma accounting for both openers in the Powerplay, Watson and Rayudu stitched a valuable 81-run partnership. The duo initially kept the score board ticking with occasional boundaries on a dry but weary surface but upped the ante in the 15th over, hitting Rashid Khan for a six each.

Ahmed broke the stand by getting rid of Rayudu, who was caught at long-off by skipper David Warner. Watson soon followed with Natarajan dismissing the Australian. The pacer then went on to claim the wicket of Dhoni as well.

# When playing for Aus my role is clear, it changes frequently in IPL: Maxwell

Australian big-hitter Glenn Maxwell has attributed his inconsistent run in the IPL over eight seasons to frequent changes in his role, something that is very clear to him when playing for his country.

Speaking to *PTI*, the Victorian explained why he has realised his potential while playing for Australia and the reason for his inconsistent run in the IPL.

"I probably would not (compare IPL and Australia career). The way I have played international cricket, it has been more of a clearer role. I know exactly how the guys will bat around me," he said.

Having overcome mental health issues last year, it seems Maxwell is back to his best in international cricket. However, the same can't be said about his

IPL performances — he has scored 58 runs at 14.50 in seven games so far.

Due to his exploits for Australia, Maxwell has always been sought after in the IPL and most recently KXIP bought him back by paying a whopping ₹10.75 crore at the auction.

"My role in IPL changes probably for most games. In IPL, a lot of teams change their sides a lot. In the Australian set-up we have the same eleven for most of the games, we all know our roles really well," said Maxwell.

He is batting at five for KXIP this season and said his role is to support the top-four.

"When you are only together for two months in the year with IPL, there is going to be chopping and changing. You are always looking for that right team balance. The team you pick at the start of the tournament might not



have the balance you think as you progress.

"We feel we are getting closer to that (team balance). I have had different experiences (in the IPL) where I have not quite performed to the level people expect but there has been no lack of trying, (or) putting the effort in training."

With the top-four facing most

of the balls, Maxwell feels he has not got enough time in the middle to make an impact. On the bowling front, he has got the opportunity to roll his arm over only thrice in seven games.

"This year has been a different role (batting at five) and I am trying to get used to it. I would like to think that I have tried to do my role as well as I can.

"We have got Nicky (Nicholas Pooran) batting unbelievably well at four. With his power-hitting, my job has been to get him on strike and be there to help finish off games.

"I have been not out four times (three actually) in seven games which is probably never happened to me in the history of my career. So, it has been a strange transition for me batting at five and one that I feel, I have started to become more accustomed to."

batsman struggled on the pitch. The talk was around getting 165, but we got 194 you know exactly why. It was unbelievable," Kohli said at the post-match presentation.

"I thought I had a few balls under my belt, and I might start striking. He (de Villiers) just came in and struck the third ball, and said he felt good. You might see a lot of people do what is done in other games, but only AB can did what he did. It was a fabulous knock."

Kohli, who remained not

out on 33 from 28 balls, said it was only thanks to the genius of de Villiers that his side got to 194 for two.

"I was happy we could string together a partnership (of 100 runs), and mine was the best seat to watch from."

Talking about the win, Kohli said, "It is a tremendous win against a very strong side. Heading into a busy week for us, it was important to start off well. The bowling unit looks that much more potent with Chris Morris coming back."

## Gayle likely to play against RCB

Dubai: Senior Kings XI Punjab batsman Chris Gayle is likely to play his first game in the ongoing IPL on Thursday after recovering from a bout of food poisoning.

Head coach Anil Kumble had said that the team could not play Gayle against Sunrisers Hyderabad last week because he was down with food poisoning. The 41-year-old also missed the following game against KKR on Saturday. The 'Universe Boss' had even posted a photo on social media from his hospital bed. KXIP posted photos of Gayle returning to the nets on Monday.

"He is fine now and it is likely that he will be playing the game against RCB (on

## Tokyo to hold gymnastics meet featuring foreign teams

Tokyo is planning to hold an international gymnastics meet next month that will exempt non-Japanese athletes from a 14-day quarantine period, an approach that might foreshadow planning for next year's postponed Olympics.

The Japanese Gymnastics Association announced the meet will feature athletes from the United States, Russia, China and Japan.

The one-day event is set for Nov 8 at the Yoyogi National Gymnasium. The Japanese news agency *Kyodo* reported that 2,000 fans will be allowed to attend, and it said athletes' travel will be restricted while in the country.

*Kyodo* said the non-Japanese athletes will take a polymerase chain reaction test before they leave home, and will also be tested daily in Japan. The event will involve 32 gymnasts — eight from each country.

Tokyo organisers are studying contingencies from next year's Olympics, which are scheduled to open on July 23, 2021. The most difficult problems is how to let 15,400 Olympic and Paralympic athletes compete in Tokyo and keep from spreading the coronavirus.

In addition to athletes, organizers will have to accommodate thousands of team officials, technical officials who run the competitions, media, broadcasters, and sponsors. Also up in the air is the question of having fans attend events, or of allowing non-Japanese fans to even enter the country.

## Nadal's Paris record will never be beaten: Murray



PARIS: Andy Murray predicts Rafael Nadal's record of 13 French Open titles will never be beaten as the British former world number one looks to bounce back in Cologne this week from his own Roland Garros disappointment.

Murray, 33, the reigning Olympic champion, crashed out of last month's French Open in straight sets with a lop-sided first round defeat to Stan Wawrinka

as he works his way back from hip surgery.

On Sunday, the Scot watched in awe as Nadal, 34, demolished Novak Djokovic 6-0, 6-2, 7-5 in the final at Roland Garros to win his 13th French Open title.

The Spaniard has also equalled the all-time record of 20 Grand Slam titles held by Roger Federer, who hailed Nadal's victory as "one of sport's greatest achievements".

Murray echoed the Swiss legend and doubts anyone will even get close to Nadal's record in Paris.

"It's an amazing achievement. I don't think that what he has done at Roland Garros will ever be beaten. I just don't see it being topped," Murray said in Cologne.

"He is one short of winning the same amount of Grand Slams as (Pete) Sampras did just at one tournament. It's incredible.

"I don't think it'll be repeated and I don't think anyone will be close."

## Cristiano tests Covid +ve

Cristiano Ronaldo has been released from the Portuguese national team camp after testing positive for Covid-19.

A statement released by the Portuguese football federation on Tuesday confirmed the 35-year-old is asymptomatic and feeling fine, but he must now undergo a period of self-isolation.

This means he will miss Portugal's Uefa Nations League clash with Sweden on Wednesday and is also a doubt for Juventus' upcoming fixtures against Crotone and Dynamo Kyiv.

The Serie A club are yet to make a statement but the Portuguese federation confirmed the rest of the Portuguese squad all returned negative Covid-19 test results on Tuesday, and Ronaldo is the only player who must miss the Sweden game.



## SAI and NRAI to jointly bio-secure shooting camp

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

The Karni Singh Range will be divided into four "risk" zones to ensure that Olympic-bound shooters can safely resume training at a two-month long national camp which will be conducted from Thursday in a bio-bubble to ward off the Covid-19 threat.

The Sports Authority of India (SAI) and the National Rifle Association of India (NRAI) will take joint responsibility of conducting the camp in a secure environment.

"In order to maintain a secure bio-bubble whereby the athletes can train safely and to prevent a coronavirus outbreak, the responsibility of maintaining the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) will be shared by the Sports Authority of India and the NRAI," read a statement from SAI on Tuesday.

The camp had earlier been postponed twice because of the pandemic and is expected to fea-

ture 32 shooters (18 men and 14 women), eight coaches, three foreign coaches and two support staff. All 15 Olympic quota winners will be a part of it.

"To maintain safety, zoning of premises by nature of risk category to minimise the contact between campers and range personnel has been planned into Green, Orange, Yellow and Red Zones," it added.

The NRAI has made boarding and lodging arrangements at a hotel close to the range, for which SAI is providing support as per existing SOP.

From the hotel to the entry to the shooting range, it would be NRAI's responsibility to ensure compliance of the SOP in order to keep the bio-bubble secure. Shooters/coaches coming from outside the Delhi-NCR region will have to be quarantined at the hotel for seven days while the locals will require self-isolation at home for a week, after which they will join other campers in the hotel for the entire duration.

## Lakshya starts with win in Denmark

Fast-rising Indian shuttler Lakshya Sen made a successful return to competitive badminton, beating Christo Popov in straight games in the opening round of the \$750,000 Denmark Open, which marked the resumption of the international calendar after a coronavirus-forced break of seven months.

The 19-year-old Indian, who claimed five titles including two Super 100 tournaments last year, produced a clinical performance to outwit Popov 21-9, 21-15 to reach the second round.

He will take on the winner of the match between Denmark's Hans-Kristian Solberg Vittinghus and Belgium's Maxime Moreels.

"I moved quite well, that was the key. In the second game he had a lead but I had made a few mistakes. I was able to cut down on them and find my rhythm," Lakshya, who is currently ranked world No 27, was quoted as saying by Badminton World Federation (BWF).

"I'm very happy to be playing again after seven months and it felt very normal on the court."
