Everyone whistling in dark on Covid

ooking at two different parts of the world, it is sometimes _difficult to believe that the whole world is engaged in a relentless but common battle against a deadly — and often lethal — viral illness that has been dubbed Covid-19.

First, there is the case of the United Kingdom. Prime Minister Boris Johnson — otherwise a smooth-talking charmer — is confronted with a rebellion within his own party and a wave of public resentment over draconian steps his Government has taken to lessen the impact of a "second" wave" of Covid-19. Among the steps just announced are restrictions in lockdown areas on people meeting those who don't live in the same household. In other areas, there are strict instructions against more than six people assembling under the same roof. There are expectations that these restrictions will persist until the New Year. Consequently, Johnson is fearful that he will be the first ruler after Oliver Cromwell to prevent Britons from celebrating Christmas.

The second example is nearer home and centres on the anti-Covid-19 strategies of West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, a feisty lady who had once proclaimed her intention of transforming Kolkata into another London. On Mahalaya, the beginning of the auspicious season this year's almanack deems it to be nearly a month, unlike the traditional 10 days — that culminates in the immersion of the Goddess Durga on Vijaya Dashami, she made a momentous announcement. Dispelling Bengali fears that this year's Durga Puja celebrations will be extremely low key and, in some cases, non-existent, she tweeted that life will be festive during the five-days when the whole of West

Bengal turns into a carnival.

The two examples, drawn from two different parts of the world, reveal something that is becoming increasingly clear: there are no established, universal norms in the global battle against Covid-19. There may well be a shared hope, cutting across national borders, that the miracle vaccine involving fierce competition among different groups of scientists, will rescue the world and usher the return of normalcy. But apart from this common wait for science to deliver us from this Wuhan virus, there is

Even within countries, there is no civic consensus Just look at the campaigning styles in the US presidential election.

The Democratic Party and its candidate Jo Biden is treading cautiously, trying to maintain a semblance of social distancing and advising its campaigners to wear masks. The rival Republican camp and incumbent President Donald Trump is not similarly inhibited. He is proceeding with mass rallies and large numbers of his supporters don't seem to bother with either masks or social distancing.

Meanwhile, the US retains the top slot in the Covid-19 infection league. It is also a control that has dispelled with the idea of a national strategy against the pandemic. The country's celebration of fierce individualism appears to have spilled over into the realms of public health. All attempts to curb individual freedom at the time of a pandemic is being seen as intrusive and, consequently, un-American.

India, thankfully, doesn't have a Constitution that celebrates 1.3 billion people doing their own thing, although it is not China where 1.4 billion people are expected to do only one thing. Our Constitution advises citizens to acquire a "scientific temper". In everyday understanding this implies that, confronted with a serious public health challenge, we are expected to follow specialist, scientific advice and not leave things to individual flights of whimsy. Unfortunately, that's easier said than done.

At the national level, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has advised utmost caution. Despite the country being in the socalled un-lockdown stage, he has repeatedly emphasised the importance of social distancing and the fanatical use of the face mask. The ongoing session of Parliament has seen staggered sittings of the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, and MPs are seated in different sections of Parliament House. In Bihar, where campaigning for the Assembly election has begun hesitantly, the ruling National Democratic Alliance is focussing on virtual rallies, despite the uneven nature of internet connectivity.

In West Bengal, where the number of daily cases is around 3,200 and the public health infrastructure is not exactly fit for purpose, there have been random lockdowns whose dates are chosen as if it is a game of Russian roulette. In Parliament, MPs from the Trinamool Congress boasted that the State Government is being guided by a Global Advisory Council headed by a Nobel Prize winner in economics. Presumably they suggested to the Chief Minister that random lockdowns would confuse the virus totally Presumably they must have also suggested that while it was a danger to young students to sit for the Joint Entrance Examinations, it was safe to go out and boisterously celebrate Durga Puja. 

The RSS affiliated Bharatiya Kisan Sangh (BKS) has joined hands with critics of the three farm sector-related Bills that will come up for passage in the Rajya Sabha on Sunday. This could put up added pressure on the Government to bring in some changes in the Bills to allay the fear of the farmers about continuation of the minimum support price (MSP) regime in future. The Lok Sabha passed the Bill on

After Akali Deal leader Harsimrat Kaur walked out of the Modi Government to protest against the Bills, the BKS stand shows that the BJP stands completely isolated on introducing these radical measures. Amid rising apprehensions that farm sector Bills passed in the Lok Sabha may not protect the interest of the agriculturists, the BKS has demanded that the Bills must be sent to the Standing Committee for wider consultations and changes.

A day after Prime Minister Narendra Modi blamed the Opposition for misleading the farmers, the BKS said the Bill is "tilted heavily towards the corporate" and would not improve the lives of farmers and should be whetted by the

Standing Committee on Agriculture headed by BJP's PC Gaddigoudar for the benefit of small farmers before turning into a law.

Opposing the Bills in their current form, the organisation has also written to Prime Minister and Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar, demanding pro-farmer provisions that do not benefit the big firms and corporates.

On Thursday, the Lok Sabha passed two agriculturerelated Bills - Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Bill, 2020, and Farmers (Empowerment

Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill, 2020 — by voice vote. On Tuesday, the House passed the Essential Commodities (Amendment) Bill, 2020, which seeks to deregulate food items, includ-

ing cereals, pulses and onions. As famers in Punjab,

Haryana and Uttar Pradesh hit the streets against three farm Bills and Harsimrat quit the Modi Government in protest, the Opposition described the move as "corporatisation" of the agriculture and in favour of big

Session to end week earlier as Covid cases up

To end on Sept 23: final decision to be taken Cabinet **Committee**

PNS NEW DELHI

The rising number of Covid-19 infection among the Members of Parliament has compelled the authorities to cut short the duration of the ongoing Monsoon Session.

The session is now expected to be terminated on September 23 instead of its scheduled October 1 closure.

The decision was taken on Saturday at the Business Advisory Committee (BAC) chaired by Speaker Om Birla, said officials, adding that final decision will be taken by the Cabinet Committee on Parliamentary Affairs.

The meeting was appraised that more than 264 people were found positive in the mandatory test. They included 30 MPs and staffers and media

The present RT-PCR Test has to be taken 72 hours before arrival in the House. Already three sitting MPs have suc-cumbed to Covid-19 and currently 30 MPs are found positive in the test.

Apart from staffers and media persons, security personnel are also subjected to the mandatory testing. Union Ministers Nitin Gadkari and Probled Patel have tested pos Prahlad Patel have tested positive in the tests. Three MPs have already died of Covid-19. Government officials

accompanying their respective Ministers during Bill discussions also have to show a negative report of RT-PCR test taken within the last 72 hours of their visit to the complex. "Since the commencement

of the Session the number of positive cases has gone up, so the Government is thinking of cutting short the session. Next week also many have to undergo mandatory tests and the number of positive cases is rising," said an official.

Before ending the session, the Government wants to get 11 ordinances passed as laws by

Parliament, sources said.
At Lok Sabha's business advisory committee meeting several Opposition parties said that they are in the favour of the decision, asserting that conducting the full 18-day sesion could be a risky affair.

The meeting also appraised that among the 264 total cases including MPs, the majority are

NIA averts terror attacks with arrest of 9 al-Qaeda terrorists

6 arrested from Bengal, 3 from Kerala in early morning raids

 $T^{\text{he National Investigation}}_{\text{Agency (NIA) on Saturday}}$ conducted simultaneous raids at several locations at Ernakulam (Kerala) and Murshidabad (West Bengal) and arrested nine terrorists associated with Pakistan-sponsored module of the UNbanned global terror outfit al-Qaeda.

"The group was planning to undertake terrorist attacks at vital installations in India with an aim to kill innocent people and strike terror in their

minds," the NIA said The search operation followed registration of a case (No. RC-31/2020/NIA/DLI) by NIA on September 11 and subsequent investigation into the matter. This led the NIA to learn about an inter-State module of al-Qaeda operatives at various locations in India,

including West Bengal and Kerala.

"The NIA has arrested six terrorists from West Bengal and three terrorists from Kerala in the early morning raids. Large quantity of incriminating materials including digital devices, documents, jehadi literature, sharp weapons, country-made firearms, a locally fabricated body armour, articles and literature used for making home-made explosive devices have been seized from their possession," the agency said. As per preliminary inves-

tigation, the arrested accused were radicalised by Pakistanbased al-Oaeda terrorists on social media and were motivated to undertake attacks at multiple places, including the National Capital Region. For this purpose, the module was actively indulging in fund raising and a few members of the gang were planning to travel to New Delhi to procure arms and ammunition These arrests have pre-empted possible terrorist attacks in various parts of the country, it

Govt should admit it is community spread, says Jain

Amid surge in coronavirus cases across India, Delhi Health Minister Satyendar Jain on Saturday took a jibe at the Centre as he said, "We're stuck Government should have admitted India is in the "community spread" stage.

"There has been a downward trend in Covid-19 positivity rate in the national Capital and it will lead to good results by next week. The positivity rate was 6.76 per cent on Friday. It has remained below seven per cent in the last twothree days. Last week, it was around 8 per cent," he said.

Jain said that the cumulative positivity rate has also dropped below 10 per cent for the first time. "Due to the increased testing over the last 10 to 12 days, Delhi has been witnessing a "downward trend" in the Covid-19 positivity rate over the past two to three days. It should lead to good results by next week," he said," he added.

The national Capital reported 4,127 new cases and 30 deaths on Friday.

The psychological thriller based on the novel of the same name by Donald Ray Pollock is directed and co-written by Antonio Campos and produced by Jake Gyllenhaal and Randall Poster. The story is simple enough. But there are many characters

and while it does, at times, become difficult to follow the thread of each character's journey, they tend to collide with each other from time to time. The way it all comes together is interesting.

What is even more brilliant about this movie is the performance that Tom Holland and Robert Pattinson have given. Holland as a young man trying to protect his family from all the evil gives a stellar performance. However, it is Pattinson who stands out here even though he doesn't have as meaty a role as Holland. He may have a total screen presence of 30-35 minutes but the way he manages to break away from Edward Cullen is stunning. As the preacher in this one and a high-pitched Southern drawl, he is a surprise.

A report says that the actor had crafted the accent in his room for days and didn't let anyone hear it — not even Campos. It is riveting to watch him deliver the dialogues in this accent, so different from the extremely polished Cullen.

While the movie itself doesn't have much to say apart from the good versus evil, God versus the devil, what makes this 138-minute film worth a watch are Holland and Pattinson's acting.



'I love playing Kalyani'

SHEETAL MAULIK, who plays Kalyani in Pyar Ki Luka Chhupi, speaks with SHALINI SAKSENA about how she ended up playing a negative character, her first break and challenges in shooting under the new normal

■ You play a negative character in Pyar Ki Luka Chhupi for the first time. How is it going?

I am thoroughly enjoying it and the same can be seen on screen. It depends on how far you are willing to take the role and how you play it out. You know your limitations and playing such a character is tougher since you are not playing just one role. Earlier, I have been part of have been positive. Doing a show where you are playing a negative role, it gives you an opportunity to explore yourself and do something that you would not do in real life. You are portraying something that is opposite to what you are, be negative and yet be funny.


■ Were there apprehensions in taking up the role?

I have always wanted to explore my acting abilities. When I got an opportunity to be part of this show, I had no reason to turn it down. There were two things playing. First, I have been waiting to work with the makers of Pyar Ki Luka Chhupi. Second, since I had already done lead roles and comedy, I wanted to take up this project. The only challenge was to train myself for the accent. Kalyani is a totally Kanpuriya woman.

■ You also had to perfect a new language. What was the preparation?

When I gave the auditions, I knew that I didn't have the accent correct. The only reason why I got the role was because they felt that I could act. But after that the team really helped me. The script comes in the language that I am supposed to speak. The only thing that I had to perfect the accent correctly for the dialogues. For this, I heard a number of jokes from the region. An assistant, Prem, who is from the area, would tell me how to speak certain words. This helped.

■ How did you get interested in acting? I am a trained Bharatanatyam dancer. I have been dancing since I was three. I still practice it and Kuchipudi. There was a contest but I couldn't participate. The organisers asked me to open the contest. I performed. Sachin Pilgaonkar, who was there, told me to take up acting. I told him, I couldn't act. He said not to worry and took me for a role in an episodic show of his. Once the make-up is on, it has been on. I have done Hindi and Marathi theatre. I have worked with the likes of Bhavana Balsavar and Shubha Khote. My journey has been that of a learner. I have not taken any acting lessons. I am able to emote and understand the character because I have done theatre.



■ How did you get your first break with Akkad Bakkad Bambey Bo?

Actually, I did Hello Dolly before this. I had played a kleptomaniac for production house Sagar Films Pvt Ltd. When they came up with Akkad Bakkad Bambey Bo, they knew I could act and that is how I came on board for this project as a lead. It was a different role. played a student.

You have now been in the industry for over a decade. How has the journey been thus far?

It has been good. One has to go with the flow. Yes, there have been changes. But if we don't move forward, we won't be able to move past the negatives. The good is that we are paid better. Punjab to use barcodes, QR codes to ensure genuine seeds for farmers

Punjab Government on Saturday decided to use advanced certification technology, including barcodes and QR codes to ensure that farmers get genuine seeds of various crops, including wheat and rice. This is a farmer-friendly initiative that will protect farmers from unscrupulous traders selling fake or low-quality seeds, a Government statement said.

Encouraged by a successful project for potato crop seeds, Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh approved deployment of advanced traceability certification through blockchain technology to ensure that farmers are not cheated with fake and uncertified seeds.

distributed to farmers in the coming seasons, beginning with 1.50 lakh quintal seeds of fodder, oil and cereal crops to be cultivated by the Punjab State Seed Corporation (Punseed) across 10,000 acres of land. The same would be done for wheat and rice seeds in the next seasons of these crops beginning Rabi 2021.

The new technology will help track the origin of the seeds to ensure that farmers get genuine and certified seed, besides eradicating the menace of spurious and low-quality seeds that have caused extensive damage to the crops in the past, said the chief minister. He expressed concern over the problem of low-quality seeds reaching farmers and adversely affecting the state's agrarian

The seed traceability was the only solution to save farmers from exploitation at the hands of unscrupulous

seed dealers and traders, he further said.

The entire certification process and verification of seed authenticity by certifying authority would be managed through software to ensure its transparency and there would be no additional leg work burden on the farmers.

Punseed is also exploring the possibility of contract farming in other states for fodder seed production to get more genuine seeds for farmers at reasonable price, said Manjit Singh Brar, MD of Punseed, who had earlier introduced seed traceability technology in potato seed production, with extremely successful outcomes.

Haryana witnessed 40.44 per cent of the total 106,261 Covid-19 cases in the last twenty days from August 30 to September 18. In addition to this, 37.54 percent of total 1092 Covid-19 deaths were reported during the same period, according to the data received from the Department of Health and Family Welfare, Haryana. Data further reveals that about 85.25 per cent of the total infected persons who died till September 18 in the State due to the virus had

Talking to The Pioneer over the phone Haryana Director General of Health Services Dr Suraj Bhan Kamboj said that the Health department has improved its Covid-19 testing considerably over the months. Covid-19 testing has doubled in September in comparison to August. Around 2,200 Covid-19 cases on an average are being reported every day over the last 20 days. It is a concern for us. One of the reasons behind the rise spike is the flouting of Covid-19 norms. Also, more people are getting themselves tested following Harvana government's decision to allow walk-in for Covid-19 test without prescription.

He said, "We are working hard to contain the spread. People need to follow Covid-19 guidelines and maintain social distancing rules. In view of the rising cases, the State administration suggested infected people home isolation. It has been observed that 80 per cent corona-infected patients recover from it if they follow necessary guidelines of the health department. The Health Department has issued new guidelines, wherein emphasis has been laid on in-person visits by 'District Home Isolation Monitoring Team' on every alternate day.

The DG Health said that around 60 to 70 per cent of the corona infected persons are in home isolation. There is a need to augment the home isolation policy so that the patients are provided appropriate care and treatment. The asymptomatic and symptomatic patients, who are in home isolation, usually are unable to follow the guidelines like staying in a separate room, a separate toilet, a caregiver to look after the needs of the patient. The 'District Home Isolation Monitoring Team' will visit the patient on alternate days to monitor if the guidelines are being followed. According to data, 63,282 Covid-19 cases were reported

on August 30 and after 20 days, the number of cases increased to 106,261 on September 18.

State has a fatality rate at 1.03 per cent. Health department continues to focus on three Ts that are testing, tracing and treatment to prevent fatalities. Department has set a target of keeping the fatality rate below one percent.

Figures suggest that about 85.25 per cent of the total infected persons who died till September 18 in the State due to the virus had comorbidities. Diabetes mellitus, a chronic metabolic disorder in which blood sugar levels are abnormally high, has emerged as the single biggest comorbidity factor (an existing medical condition) in the deaths of patients infected with coronavirus in Haryana. A State Government doc-

tor said that multiple comorbidities means that the patients had more than one existing medical condition such as hypertension and diabetes or renal function impairment which affected their conditions. "Patients with comorbidity are immunocompromised and their organs are also not in a good shape," he said.

About 931 of the total 1092 infected persons who died till September 18 in the state due to the virus had comorbidities. "Our experience is that a number of coronavirus infected patients admitted in hospitals have quite high levels of blood sugar. This is because either they have diabetes or pre-diabetes. Also, the stress of the Covid-19 infection in a patient can result in an adrenaline surge, thus increasing the blood sugar levels. The infection can also lead to fall in insulin level due to the steroids given to patients," said Dr Dhruva Chaudhary, who is also the nodal officer for Covid-19 in Haryana

Meanwhile, as the cases in Gurugram continue to soar, Amit Khatri, Deputy Commissioner, Gurugram has directed all government and private hospitals in the district to reserve at least 35 per cent beds for Covid-19 patients.

Govt to check 02 level of home-isolated patients

The Health Department has constituted dedicated teams that would go door-to-door and measure the oxygen level of Covid-19 patients staying in home isolation across the state, officials said on Saturday. The initiative, officials added, was taken in the wake of reports highlighting sudden drop in tomatic patients across the

"The teams were constituted at Panchayat level for rural Jharkhand and ward level in urban areas to keep a tab on the oxygen level of patients staying in home isolation," said State National Health Mission (NHM) Director, Dr. Ravi Shankar Shukla.

Many asymptomatic Covid patients, Shukla said, were experiencing a fall in the oxygen level in their bodies, which could prove fatal if not treated on time.

As per the home isolation norms set by the Government, patients in home isolation should have an oximeter at home to keep a check on the

oxygen level in their body. However, many patients could not afford an oximeter, officials said. The inspection teams will identify such patients, who do not have an oximeter at home, and measure their oxygen level in the first phase of the drive.

"The teams will take all necessary precautions as per the protocol during the drive. All members of these teams will wear PPE kits when they visit the homes of Covid patients," said Shukla, adding that oximeters and PPE kits were already provided to the teams in various districts.

An oximeter, available in medicine shops, comprises a monitor which contains the batteries and display, a probe, which consists of light emitting diodes, and a light detector called a photo-detector. The probe in the machine senses the user's pulse.

The oximeter measures pulse rate and the oxygen saturation of haemoglobin in arterial blood. Normal readings, according to doctors, range from 95 per cent to 100 per cent. Anything less, and the user should get medical assistance from a doctor.

As per latest figures with the health department, there were 13,610 active cases of Covid-19 infection in Jharkhand. More than half of these patients, sources said, were in home isolation. So far, the state has reported 68,638 cases of Covid infection, and nearly 55,000 patients have recovered.

More than 600 Covid and a majority of them were suffering from some or the other comorbid condition, offi-

While nearly 75 per cent of the deceased were older than 50 years, at least 29 Covid victims in the state were younger than 30 years. The government, however, is yet to compile data of patients who died in home

isolation. As per government data, around 16.50 lakh people have been tested for Covid-19 in Iharkhand so far, and most of them were from urban areas. Latest figures show that around 3000 people were battling the virus in Ranchi, while around 2800 were undergoing treatment in Jamshedpur.

Covid cases cross 11,500 in East Singhbhum

¬he Rajya Sabha on Saturday I passed two legislations, The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (Second Amendment) Bill 2020 and The Epidemic Diseases (Amendment) Bill,

The Epidemic Diseases (Amendment) Bill provides for up to five years in jail for those attacking doctors and healthcare workers fighting the COVID-19 outbreak or during any situation akin to the current

Speaking on the Bill in the Rajya Sabha, Union Health Minister Dr Harsh Vardhan said that the bill was required to prevent offences against

healthcare professionals.

"Many healthcare workers including doctors, paramedics were insulted in some form or the other, due to stigma attached to COVID-19. Centre government acted on this situation found that there was a need for a law, a prohibitory mechanism against such incidents," Dr Harsh Vardhan said.

However, Trinamool Congress (TMC) MP Derek O'Brien termed the Bill an attempt to encroach states' constitutionally assigned func-

Speaking while the discussions on the bill were underway, the TMC MP said that Bengal already had laws to deal with prevention of violence against doctors and healthcare workers

"You thought of healthcare workers now? Bengal has Medicare Service Prevention of Violence and Damage to Property Act 2009. What happens to it? Bill is an attempt to encroach states' constitutionally assigned functioning," O'Brien

The Upper House had earlier passed the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 (Second Amendment) Bill.

Moving the IBC Bill in Rajya Sabha Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said, "IBC is such a critical part of business now. On the NPAs of scheduled commercial banks, I just want to highlight how IBC is actual ly serving the purpose. The priority is to keep companies to be a going concern rather than liquidate them?

The Bill mandates that a default on repayments from March 25, the day when a nationwide lockdown began to curb the spread of coronavirus. would not be considered for initiating insolvency proceedings for at least six months.

The upper house which saw minimal disruptions during the last two days passed four Bills together with the controversial Farmers bill and Homeopathy bill in Friday.

name to sell their products.

notice, Khadi Global has also discontinued using its website www.khadiglobalstore.com and also removed its social media pages on Twitter, Facebook and Instagram. It has sought 10-day time to remove all such contents and product using the brand name "Khadi". KVIC action has also resulted in shutting down of a number of stores across the country that were selling fake Khadi prod-

These e-commerce portals were selling products like Khadi masks, herbals soaps, sham-poos, cosmetics, herbal mehandi, jackets, kurta and many such products through different sellers using the brand name "Khadi". This created a false impression among online buyers that these commodities were genuine "Khadi" products. A majority of the products that have been removed were being sold by one Ayush E-Traders. This firm has confirmed to KVIC that it has removed 140

links for various products that were being sold as "Vagad's Khadi Products".

There has been a steep rise in violation of Khadi trademark as the popularity of Khadi grew manifold in recent years after the Hon'ble Prime Minister's appeal to buy Khadi products. Exploiting this opportunity, a number of online sellers began selling random products in the name of Khadi.

mushroomed in different cities that were selling fake Khadi products. In recent months, particularly during the Covid-19 lockdown, there was a huge proliferation of such fraudulent online sellers. However, to enable online customers to buy genuine Khadi products, KVIĆ has launched its e-portal selling a range of 300 products online

ECI to set up national database to track status of ex-gratia payments

Taking note of the delay in **I** giving compensation, the Election commission (EC) is planning to set up a database to track the status of ex-gratia payments to those who got injured or lost their lives while polling or poll-related duty. In a letter to chief electoral officers of all states and union territories, the EC has asked to track all such claims. At present, the poll watchdog pays ₹10 lakh to the next of kin of those who died in poll duties through

cheques. "A stern view has been taken of the institutional failure and lack of sensitivity, bordering on apathy, on part of the administrative machinery, which failed to respect the memory of the departed," EC said in the letter. The letter asked CEOs to create a digital database to track the settlement of such legacy claims and all future claims. A national level database will also be created by the commission.

EC is also working out the modalities of how payments will be expedited to reduce any kind of inconvenience to the families. Last month, Pramila Devi,

the wife of late Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) jawan Ramesh Kumar, 31, wrote to chief election commissioner (CEC) Sunil Arora, highlighting the delay in such payments. Kumar died in a grenade attack during the 2002 Jammu and Kashmir elections. In her letter dated August 10, Devi said she had not received the payment; she was entitled to ₹5 lakh as per the allotment 18 years ago. Following her letter, the Commission acted immediately to get the sum remitted to her without any further delay and later also transferred ₹15 lakhs to her account.

mid ongoing blame-game Abetween the developed and developing nations on who should pay for increasing carbon footprints, a study has pointed out that a fifth of carbon dioxide emissions come from multinational companies' global supply chains which in effect outsourced to poorer parts of the world.

The study, which is published in Nature Climate Change, mapped the emissions generated by multinationals' assets and suppliers abroad and found that the flow of investment is typically from developed countries to developing ones . "Hence emissions be assigned to countries where the investment comes from, rather than countries where the emissions are generated," said

the study.

Mapping the global flow of investment, researchers from UCL and Tianjin University found steady increases in investment from developed to developing countries. For instance, between 2011 and 2016 emissions generated through investment from the US to India increased by nearly half (from 48.3 million tons to 70.7 million tons), while in the same vears emissions generated through investment from China to south-east Asia increased tenfold (from 0.7 million tons to 8.2 million

In contrast, the study found that carbon emissions from multinationals' foreign investment fell from a peak of 22 per cent of all emissions in 2011 to 18.7 per cent in 2016. Researchers said this was a



result of a trend of "de-globalisation", with the volume of foreign direct investment shrinking, as well as new technologies and processes making industries more carbon efficient.

The findings by UCL and Tianjin University holds immense importance amid the ongoing blamegame between the developed and developing nations on the increasing climate change threat owing to the green house gas emission.

"Multinational companies have enormous influence stretching far beyond national borders. "However, companies' climate change policies often have little effect when it comes to big investment decisions such as where to build supply chains.

"Assigning emissions to the investor country means multinationals are more accountable for the emissions they generate as a result of these decisions."

Lead author Dr Zengkai Zhang, of Tianjin University, said: "Multinationals are increasingly transferring investment from developed to developing countries. This has the effect of reduc-

ing developed countries' emissions while placing a greater emissions burden on poorer countries. At the same time it is likely to create higher emissions overall, as investment is moved to more 'carbon intense'

Govt plans environment-friendly scrapping of vehicles, RS told PNS ■ NEW DELHI Scrapping Policy- is preparing

rhe Centre on Saturday said **⊥** a Cabinet note has been formulated for the vehicle $scrapping\ policy.$

In reply to a question, Minister of State for Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) VK Singh informed the Rajya Sabha that the Government has formulated a Cabinet note on creation of an ecosystem for voluntary and environment friendly phasing out of unfit and old polluting vehicles.

The proposed policy, once approved, will be applicable on vehicles, the government had said earlier.

A MoRTH official said

to implement the vehicle scrap policy for the old four wheelers (car) and two wheelers (scooter bike) from next month. The policy was sent for a

fresh round of consultation with stakeholders on the direction of the PMO.

Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gaďakri had earlier this year said once the policy is approved, India could emerge as a hub for automobile manufacturing as key raw material available from scrapping steel, aluminium and plastic are bound to be recycled, bringing down automobile prices by "20-30%t".

Government had proposed amendments to motor vehicle rules to allow scrapping of vehicles older than 15 years in a bid to spur adoption of electrical vehicles. In a draft notification, the

government proposed renewal of fitness certificates for vehicles older than 15 years every six months instead of the current time-frame of one When come into force,

the automobile sector will gain momentum as demand for new vehicles increases. As per a report in the MoRTH, customers will get new vehicles up to 30 percent cheaper while older vehicles will reduce air pollution by 25 percent.

RS approves amendments to insolvency law

Decision on extending the suspension of relevant provisions will be taken next week: Fin Min

 $R^{\mbox{\scriptsize ajya}}$ Sabha on Saturday passed amendments to the insolvency law for suspension of fresh insolvency proceedings for at least six months starting March 25 amid the coronavirus pandemic, with Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman saying a decision on extending the suspension of relevant provisions will be taken next week.

In the wake of the COVID-19 situation, the government decided to suspend the provisions starting from March 25 for six months by promulgating an ordinance in June.

Default on repayments from March 25, the day when the nationwide lockdown began to curb coronavirus infections, would not be considered for initiating insolvency proceedings for at least six

The six-month period is

ending next week.

The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (Second Amendment) Bill, 2020, seeks to replace the ordinance issued in June, was passed by a voice vote after a brief discussion.

Replying to the debate, Finance and Corporate Affairs Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said the suspension of provisions will end next week.

"At the moment, amend-

ment to the Code gives me a provision to only extend till one year. If at all, because it is coming to an end on September 25 this year, September 24 itself we have to make an announcement about what is going to happen. But even if I do, it means by March it should be ending...," the minister

The minister also clarified that insolvency proceedings against corporates defaulting on loans prior to March 25 will continue and the amendment will not stall those cases.

A majority of the opposition parties also supported the bill but urged the government to provide interest waiver on loans to farmers and poor people suffering due to the OVID-19 crisis.

During the debate on the bill, many members expressed fears over its possible misuse by corporates even as they hoped that it will help in reviving the

On members' queries regarding liability of personal guarantors in the IBC, Sitharaman said the corporate debtor often has guarantors.

'So, for comprehensive corporate insolvency resolution and liquidation we felt it was necessary that the insolvency of the corporate debtor as well as its guarantors are considered

together to whatever extent it is possible," Sitharaman said.

On queries about the urgency to bring the ordinance in the first place, Sitharaman said that "between sessions if there is a need for ordinance because the ground situation demands it, I would think a responsive government's duty is to at least use the ordinance to show that we are there with the people of India."

"So to that extent, I am sure the House will appreciate that as and when the government decides for ordinance it is because of that, and whenever the next session happens we come back," she said

Because of the COVID-19 andemic, the minister said, businesses faced trouble.

So it was decided "that it was better to suspend Sections 7, 9 and 10 of IBC so that we can prevent corporate persons, which are experiencing distress on account of the unprecedented situation, being pushed insolvency proceedings".

Sections 7, 9 and 10 deal with initiation of corporate insolvency resolution process by financial creditor, operational creditor and corporate debtor, respectively. The minister further said the IBC is a critical part of business now, and cited data to show how the code had performed.

Citing data for NPAs of commercial banks during 2018-19, she informed the House that Lok Adalats recovered 5.3 per cent, Debt Recovery Tribunals (DRTs) recovered 3.5 per cent and SARFAESI recovered 14.5 per

On the other hand, IBC ensured 42.5 per cent of recov-

Sitharaman further said that most of the resolutions are happening to make the company to be a going concern

only.
"Priority is to keep the company to be a going concern rather than to liquidate them at the earliest," she said adding that 258 companies were saved from going bankrupt through the IBC process, while 965 firms went for liquidation.

"... 258 companies were rescued which means employment is back again with them. Companies which have been liquidated in total, threefourths of them were defunct and were also given liquidation solution and therefore at least loss of employment was reduced," she said.

According to her, 258 companies rescued had assets of Rs 96,000 crore and the 965 companies sent for liquidation had assets of Rs 38,000 crore.

Govt allows cos with not less than 300 workers to fire staff without its nod

New Delhi: Companies having not less than 300 workers will soon be allowed to hire and fire workers without seeking prior government permission, with the labour ministry proposing changes to rules in a bill introduced in Lok Sabha on Saturday.

The proposal, which was the bone of contention between the ministry and trade unions, is part of the Industrial Relation Code Bill 2020.

Currently, only those industrial establishments with less than 100 employees are permitted to hire and fire their staff without permission of the government.

The bill was introduced by Labour Minister Santosh Gangwar amid opposition from Congress and few other

The Industrial Relation Code Bill 2019 was introduced in Lok Sabha last year and subsequently sent to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Labour. This bill was withdrawn on Saturday.

An earlier draft bill circulated by the labour ministry for discussion had also proposed

the criteria that companies having not less than 300 employees can hire and fire without the government's permission. However, this provision faced stiff opposition from trade unions and was not included in the 2019 bill.

Earlier this year, the Parliamentary committee also made a case of allowing companies having less than 300 workers to go for retrenchment of staff or closure without government permission.

States like Rajasthan have already increased the threshold to 300 workers, which according to the labour ministry has resulted in an increase in employment and a decrease in retrenchment, the committee had pointed out in its report.

With regard to the threshold, the government has proposed Section 77(1) in the The Industrial Relation Code

According to the Section, the provisions of "this Chapter (lay-off, retrenchment and closure in certain establishment) shall apply to an industrial establishment (not being an establishment of a seasonal

The proposal, which was the bone of contention between the ministry and trade unions, is part of the **Industrial Relation** Code Bill 2020

character or in which work is performed only intermittently) in which not less than three hundred workers, or such higher number of workers as may be notified by the appropriate Government, were employed on an average per working day in the preceding twelve

Apart from this code, two others -- Occupational Safety, Health And Working Conditions Code, 2020 and the Code On Social Security, 2020 -- were also introduced by the minister in Lok Sabha.

Among others, Congress leaders -- Manish Tewari and Shashi Tharoor -- opposed the introduction of the three bills. Tewari noted these three

bills are fundamentally changed versions of their earlier forms and urged the minister to with-

draw them and hold wider consultations before introducing

These bills are also a blow to the rights of workers, he added.

With respect to the industrial relations code, Tharoor said it severely restricts the right of workers to strike and also allows state or central governments to amend the threshold for applicability relating to layoffs and retrench-

In Lok Sabha, Gangwar said that over 29 labour laws have been merged into four codes and that one of them has already been passed.

The Code on Wages Bill, 2019 was passed by Parliament last year. Gangwar noted that the

government engaged in wider consultations over these bills with various stakeholders and that more than 6,000 comments were received online on These bills were later sent

to a standing committee and 174 of its 233 recommendations have been accepted, the minister said.

2019, sovereign debt shrank 3 per cent to reach USD 100.9 billion, it said, adding, this decrease was primarily due to a fall in FII investment in G-Sec - the second largest constituent - by 23.3 per cent to USD 21.6 billion from USD 28.3 billion a year ago.

TikTok and its parent company, ByteDance Ltd., filed a complaint late Friday night challenging the Trump administration's recent moves to prevent the app from operating in the U.S. The lawsuit marks the second time TikTok has challenged President Donald Trump's actions in court, bringing a high-stakes geopolitical fight over technology and trade into the U.S. legal system.

Trump exceeded his authority, the company said, and did so for political reasons rather than to stop an "unusual and extraordinary threat" to the U.S., as the law requires. TikTok also said the ban violates its First Amendment free-speech rights.

The White House didn't immediately respond to a request for comment.

Trump's actions would "destroy an online community where millions of Americans have come together to express themselves," according to the complaint. The company claimed that the U.S. government has "ignored evidence" showing TikTok's commitment to the privacy and security of its American users.

On August 6, Trump issued an executive order saying he would ban transactions with the app within 45 days, arguing that the social network's Chinese ownership made it a national security threat. TikTok sued to block that order in federal court in Californa in August. But on Friday, the Commerce Dept, moving to implement Trump's order, said TikTok would be banned in the U.S. starting on Nov. 12 unless it could complete a takeover deal that assuages the government's concerns.

Trump's order followed an investigation by the Committee on Foreign Investment in the U.S., which reviews proposed acquisitions of domestic businesses by overseas investors for national security concerns. And it set off a flurry of attempted deal-making, pushing ByteDance to seek a sale of TikTok's American operations to a U.S. company. TikTok is currently in talks with Oracle Corp. about a possible deal.

Moroccans protest Arab nations Thai protesters hold ambitious rally for democratic reforms

Bangkok: Protesters gathered on Saturday in Bangkok for the most ambitious rally so far in a pro-democracy campaign that has shaken up the government and Thailand's conservative establishment.

Organisers predicted that as many as 50,000 will march over two days in an area of the capital historically associated with political protests, after an estimated 10,000 people turned out for the last major rally on Aug. 16. But the early turnout was modest Saturday as a steady light rain fell.

Demonstrators wore face masks, but ignored a Thursday night plea from Prime Minister Prayuth Chan-ocha to cancel the event, which he said risked spreading the coronavirus and derailing recovery of Thailand's battered economy.

The core demands declared by the protesters in July were the dissolution of parliament with fresh elections, a new constitution and an end to intimidation of political activists.

... He's (Shubman) certainly one of those guys... I see him batting at the top of the order throughout the campaign," added the newly-appointed KKR coach in a media interaction. Impressed with the way, the

21-year-old Shubman carries himself, the Kiwi great said he wants to give the Indian youngster his own space and groom the other junior members in the

"I think he's got a bit of a presence about him, even at this young age, very respectful as well. I know DK (captain Dinesh Karthik) really respects him as a person as a cricket brain as well. And I think he's going to be another wonderful resource for DK both on and off the field," McCullum said.

"I want to see the most out of him is just to grow on his own time, his own space but also take those around him, who are still reasonably inexperienced and

grow at the same rate that he's growing in his own career. "If we can do that, then the

experience we can get into these guys at a young age, and pressure moments is going to be a very, very good thing for KKR this season. He's got a very big role."

KKR started off well winning four of their first five matches, but they lost six matches on the trot in the business end to miss the qualifiers by a whisker.

"He was a guy who we were desperate to get batting (at the auction) in the middle order around Russell and Karthik... He provides us with a really, really strong middle-order."

KKR chief mentor David Hussey had earlier said Russell is best suited at No 3 but McCullum was of the opinion that the star Jamaican is an ideal finisher in the T20 format and the team will have a 'horses-for-courses'

"I think his game is definite-

ly suited to probably the last 10 overs of a T20 game. But there may be times where the matchups are right we can get in Andre a little bit earlier, up the order. "That will be a horses for

ovid-19 has taken the country offguard and is seen impacting the Indian economy. As per the Moody's report published in June 2020, India's GDP is expected to shrink by 3.1%. Going one step further, the Dun and Bradstreet Report released in August 2020 predicted that the GDP would contract by 4.5% this fiscal year. Amidst these daunting numbers, one industry that is still reflecting a ray of hope while showing unprecedented growth in India is the Education Technology, that is, the Ed-Tech sector. RS Components, analysing the Crunchbase data, observes that other than the USA, India is the second country that hosts the most number of Ed-Tech companies in the world.

In 2020, Ed-Tech stands as the most funded business sector in India. Only between January and July \$998 Mn has been invested across 31 deals. Furthermore, the ed-tech sector, according to the Omidyar, Redseer report, 2020, is expected to touch a size of \$3.5 Bn by 2022.

To understand the inner working of this sector and map its growth, let us delve deeper and analyse the current scenario along with the latest trends, impact, opportunities, possible pitfalls and the way ahead for the Ed-Tech

INDIAN ED-TECH INDUSTRY; GROWTH AND INVESTMENT

The umbrella term of 'Ed-Tech' largely consists of five segments, which include Online Teaching and Test Preparation; Assessment, Guidance and Mentoring; Skill Development and Certification; Professional Development Programmes, Infrastructural and Administrative Solutions. Amongst these segments, Online Teaching and Test Preparation leads the market with a 64% share and further anticipating size of \$515 Mn by 2021. The sector is lately experiencing a boom as it alchemises with artificial intelligence and neuroscience

The growth of Ed-Tech in India started around 2004-05 when ventures such as Everonn, NIIT and Educomp made their mark through digital course content, smart classrooms and skill development programs. The industry has been reaching new heights with 3000 companies, including Byju's, Unacademy etc. along with various investors like Tiger Global, General Atlantic, Steadview Capital, GGV Capital, Foundation Holding, Aarin Capital, Simplilearn and Blume Ventures venturing into this landscape.

An Extraordinary Life stands out because of the main protagonist, Manohar Parrikar. He reminds the readers of a super-hero character from the Hindi movies, writes KUMAR CHELLAPPAN

Parrikar: A man extraordinaire

t was on a Friday (to be precise, on November 13, 2015) that I met Manohar Parrikar, the country's defence minister for the first and last time. He flew into the Indian Naval Station Rajali, around 80 km south of Chennai by a Boeing Poseidon-8 India (Boeing P-80I) the country's newly acquired Long Range Maritime Patrol Aircraft, described as the country's eyes and ears up in the air.

As he strode into the auditorium, I could feel the powerful aura of elegance associated with him. It was for the induction into service of the eight aircraft, each procured at a cost of ₹1,500 crore he flew down to Rajali despite the heavy rains and winds that tormented northern Tamil Nadu on that Friday.

The induction ceremony was as simple as the chief guest. There was no big speech or show. The minister unveiled a plaque installed on the side of the 4.9 km long runway and he was presented with a memento by Admiral Dhowan, the then chief of naval staff.

Before embarking the aircraft for his onward journey to New Delhi, the minister was surrounded by journalists for some possible 'bytes'. All were asking him about the One Rank One Pension controversy generated by a section of exservicemen who had accused the government with going back on the promise. Some of them had threatened to return the medals they received from the Government for their meritorious services to the nation. And some had even burnt the medals and ribbons!

"Returning the medals and burning the medals are like insulting the nation. Medals are a recognition of bravery, for the service to the nation. It has nothing to do with service conditions whereas OROP is with service conditions. It does not say you are entitled for medals," Parrikar replied. He declined to comment when asked whether the continuing agitation has some political motives. "It is for those who are agitating to prove that it is not politically motivated. Let them prove it themselves," said the minister. When he was about to leave, I asked him about his two hour long journey in the Poseidon 80-I from Andamans to Arkkonam and also about the possibilities of the revival of Durand Cup Football Championship hosted by

The word football literally 'threw him out of balance'. "Well, I'll answer your question on football first. I'll definitely and seriously look into how to



promote Durand Cup Football tournament. It is Asia's oldest and world's third oldest championship and it is our responsibility to revive it," he said.

To convince me about his seriousness, Parrikar told me that he was passionate about football. "Do you know that I myself was a football player and have played in all levels of the games. Goans are passionate about the game. It was during my first tenure as chief minister I declared football as Goa's official game. We have village level tournaments as well as league matches featuring big time clubs. I had played the game even while I was pursing my studies in IIT Bombay. It was because of an injury, I had to hang my boots so early," he opened up. The enthusiasm and energy when he spoke of football had to be seen to believe. And that too from the country's defence minister.

It was another thing that politics took the front seat as he had to return to Panaji as chief minister of Goa. Manohar Parrikar looked so healthy and energetic on that Friday in 2015 and nobody would have imagined even in their wildest dreams he had some medical issues which would snuff out that life so

Manohar Parrikar was the first BJP chief minister of Goa and also the tenth chief minister of the State. Pramod Sawant, the present Chief Minister is the 13th to occupy the *gaddi*. Nobody has bothered to write the biographies of the other 12 chief ministers while two young journalists, Sadguru Patil and Mayabhushan Nagvenkar selected Manohar Parrikar as their subject speaks volumes about the greatness and uniqueness of the man.


For people from Goa, Parrikar is a *swayamsevak* (volunteer) of the RSS, a B Tech graduate from IIT Bombay in metallurgical engineering (an important and tough branch of technology) and a BJP worker. The authors, who have interviewed or interacted with Parrikar more

than 20 times during his tenure as leader of the opposition and chief minister, had to walk a tight rope to convince the world about their neutrality and impartiality while writing about the life and times of a Sangh Parivar man. They have succeeded in it because they have left no stones unturned while writing about Parrikar.

The authors while introducing Parrikar to the readers said that he had to settle for metallurgy engineering in IIT, 'ranked low in the elite institution's flaunting order compared to other branches of engineering'. Metallurgy engineering was a topic very much in demand in those days because the country's nuclear and space programmes and the flourishing metal industries were on the prowl for graduates in metallurgy.

How Parrikar single-handedly built the BJP into a powerful force in Goa politics is interesting. A small state dominated by the Maharashtravadi Gomantak Party and the Congress had to yield space to the Hindutwa politics only because of the kind of work done by Parrikar and associates. In a democracy, all political parties should have space to grow, grow fairly. Parrikar has succeeded in developing his political party into a major entity like the manager/coach a soccer team builds a team from scratch to that of a winning combination.

Parrikar as leader of opposition and then as Chief Minister were two different personalities, charge the authors. Since I am not familiar with Goan politics, let me stay away from that controversy. But how many politicians are there in India who fight corruption with the same dedication with which they fight the system while in the Opposition? What happened to the 2G Spectrum, Coal Gate, Commonwealth Games scam, National Herald scam, Bofors scam and a host of other such cases? The prime suspects are still seen in TV channels and parliamentary debates cocking



a snook at the millions. This is India that is Bharat.

But why didn't Goans take up violation of court orders, if any, in the mining licence and casino issues have been left untold. It definitely would have added to the value of the book. These instances are also parts of the folklore associated with Goa and Parrikar. Similarly, the authors' criticism in Parrikar surrounding himself with persons from the GSB community to which he belonged sounded out of place. I have seen how ministers belonging to the Dravidian parties appoint only members from their caste in their personal staff. Same is the case with Muslim League, Kerala Congress leaders in my home state! The only difference is that casteism in Kerala is not severe as it is in TN!

"An Extraordinary Life" stands out only because of the main protagonist, Manohar Parrikar. He reminds the readers about characters in Hindi movies, who succumb to fate which claims their lives in the form of cancer or villains' gun shots. This Parrikar was a *Manohar* person.

Sadasuhags: The cross-dressers...

Sacred and Profane by GS Sachdeva is a secular take on the world's most unorthodox and mystifying rituals, customs and traditions. An edited excerpt:

n the evolution of human society and community living, religion, however primitive, elemental or minimalistic, has always had a place in some form or manner. Even aboriginal and tribal denominations had pseudo-religious totemic faiths, which many of them still carry with staunch fervour. Religion, for them, had a different meaning and purpose in life. It was more relevant to mundane things in life like warding off adversity, illluck, illness, etc. For some, religion was a shield against natural calamities like droughts and floods, earthquakes or volcanic eruptions. Religion, to this effect, treated everything incomprehensible as a god and worshipped it to propitiate for benevolence. Later, religion came to be sought and followed for higher virtues, spiritual values, after-life treatment and salvation from rebirth.

Religion has evolved with time as few spiritually enlightened beings were blessed with unique reverential experiences and divine revelations, which were interpreted differently by different groups of people, with shifting of emphasis on traditional tenets and prevalent rituals. As a result, small groups tended to branch off as separate religious sects with differential beliefs and varied pronouncements on attendant rituals. Gradually, these break-away branches developed their own tenets and conspicuous identities with separate prayer systems and anomalized ritualistic practices that came to be recognized as distinct from the



The same happened for Sadasuhags. This sect, though originally part of mainstream Hinduism, leaned in a different direction, highlighting a prominent belief that all living persons are the brides of the Eternal God, irrespective of their gender. Thus, they remain brides forever and never get widowed because God is immortal and eternal. With this cognition and motivation, they dress as women, embellish themselves in feminine ways and mentally pray to please God, imagining him as the groom. With passage of time and growing disapprobation of crossdressing by the prudish society, this sect went into hiding and has gradually disappeared. These

Besides, social customs, at times, acquire oddities and unusual practices and turn into superstitions that defy common logic, where optical physicality tends to be illusory or remains unexplained in rational terms; for example, the Koovagam festival of transgenders, the weeping statue, prejudice against the number thirteen or the Spanish festival of Devil's Jump. While some oddities may be backed by reason like exaltation of pigs for economic necessity or the seasonal facts related to the Lenten Moon or Montanna for social justice. [...]

Koovagam Festival of Transgenders in Tamil Nadu

Koovagam is the time and place, when and where transgen-

ders flaunt their uniqueness and sexuality in style without any fear of prejudice or stigma.

Koovagam, a little-known village in Villupuram district of Tamil Nadu, hosts the biggest festival for the third gender or eunuchs, called Aravanis in Tamil. This festival lasts for one week and is celebrated with big rallies, beauty pageants, sports events, gala feasts and other festivities. People from the transgender community also tie nuptial knots with a deity at the local Koothandavar temple and freely consummate their marriage in the open fields under a full moon sky. The final day of the week-long celebrations falls on a full moon night in April,


every year.

beautiful woman, to marry a

local boy, Aravan, for a night. This was because Aravan was to be sacrificed the next morning during the Kurukshetra war and no woman had come forward to tie the knot. Lord Krishna blessed him with this bliss of marital pleasure. The eunuchs, called Aravanis in Tamil Nadu, assume the role of Mohini every year and marry the legendary Aravan at the Koothandavar tem ple in a hallowed tradition.

The euphoric celebration has been accepted so far as an ageold practice, but has been condemned in the recent times, since the morning after the consummation of ritualistic marriage, the fields look like dump yard of condoms, which are often, in amusement, picked up by young children to the embarrassment of the parents and possibly consti-



has been seen lately that sex workers, homosexuals, bi-sexuals, bi-curious and even crossdressers enter the fest and boldly mingle with their cognate peers.

Besides, many seem in unusual hurry to have multiple sex escapades during this licentious time. This has vitiated the solemn environment and local resistance to the festivities is growing. 

Killing minorities in name of blasphemy in Pak

Tn Pakistan, the majority Lcommunity has licence to kill anyone, particularly persons from minority communities, in the name of blasphemy without waiting for court trials. The ugliest part is that the murderer is hailed as a "ghazi" or "martyr" to the nation. It's time the world wakes up

to the medieval treatment of religious minorities in Pakistan. The blasphemy law was first introduced in 1860 by the colonial administration. The law stipulated ten years of imprisonment or fine or both. Later the law was amended in 1927. In 1953, when anti-Ahmadiyya riots erupted, Jamaat-e-Islami demanded amendments to the law but the Government of Pakistan did not entertain its requests. However, when anti-Ahmadiyya riots erupted again in 1974, the second Amendment was introduced in the Constitution of Pakistan and all Islamist parties came together under the banner of Tehreek-e-Tahaffuz-e-Khatame-Nabuwwat (movement for the protection of the finality of the Prophethood). Later in 1984, the Zia-Ul-Haq regime passed an anti-Ahmadiyya ordinance, which decreed that "Ahmadis cannot call themselves Muslims" or "pose as Muslim", and those who defied the law faced three years in prison.

Cases of extortion from minorities in Pakistan are frequent but rarely reported to authorities for the fear of reprisals. Victims pay huge ransoms as protection money to mosques and madrassas to save their lives. Otherwise they have to leave their business and

properties. A Hindu friend of mine narrated one such incident to me: "Due to coronavirus, our

temple is closed so I am performing my early morning prayers (bhajans) at home only. One day my neighbour knocked at my door and threatened our family. 'You Hindus should go to India and sing your bhajans there. If you want to live in Pakistan, live quietly, don't chant Krishna nonsense

early morning." He added, "Believe me I was not chanting loudly. My neighbour always look for an opportunity to browbeat us so that under pressure we should sell our apartment to them and leave this place, while they always listen Indian music loudly all the time. Even there is a mosque-madrasa in our apartments where loudspeakers keep on blaring out."

In 2009, Aasya Noreen, better known as Asia Bibi, a Pakistani Christian, was accused of blasphemy. "Why you used my cup for drinking water? You are non-Muslim, a 'kafir." Argument over this led to Noreen's arrest in 2010. She was convicted of blasphemy by a Pakistani court and sentenced to death. Minorities Minister Shahbaz Bhatti and Punjab Governor Salman Taseer both were assassinated for advocating on behalf of Asia Bibi and opposing the blasphemy laws.

Under global pressure, in 2018, the Supreme Court of Pakistan acquitted Asia Bibi on grounds that there was insufficient evidence. But she was not released from custody because of safety concerns. A Muslim cleric Maulana Yousaf Qureshi announced a bounty of 500,000 Pakistani Rupees to anyone who would kill Asia Bibi. In 2019, she finally got a safe passage and arrived in Canada, but she continues to

receive threat to her life. Mishal Khan, a student of



mass communication of Abdul Wali Khan University, was killed in 2017 on the premises of the university by a mob on allegation of posting blasphemous content online. He was in the hostel of the university when he was stripped naked and severely beaten up by a group of students and then shot. He succumbed to his injuries. The mob was kicking his lifeless body and beating it with wooden planks. His body was then thrown from the second floor of the building. The mob even tried to burn his body while chanting "Allah-o-Akbar". At least 25 law enforce-

ment officers were present

there, but no action was taken. Later investigations found that the content Mishal posted had only secular views and references to books on democracy and equality of humanity. But before this realisation came out, Pakistan had already lost a beautiful soul.

Recently, on July 29, Tahir Naseem, an American, was shot dead inside a Pakistani courtroom where he had gone for a trial for alleged blasphemy. He was an Ahmadiyya but one of my sources told me that he was having mental issues. His murderer justified the killing, "A light appeared in my dream last night and ordered me to kill this enemy of Allah so that I can be awarded with gift of heaven."

The murderer was praised by a majority of people in Pakistan and even Government officials and politicians used his picture as their display picture (DP) on their social media profiles. When I reported this case


and announced a campaign on social media against the blasphemy laws, forced conversions and enforced disappearances in Pakistan and organised a protest at the Consulate General of Pakistan in Houston, I received many life threats and was targeted by unknown profiles on the social media.

Blasphemy Law (Clause, 295C) of Pakistan panel court reads: "Whoever by words, either spoken or written or by visible representation or by any imputation, innuendo or insinuation, directly or indirectly, defiles the sacred name of the Holy prophet Muhammad (PBUH) shall be punished with death or imprisonment for life and shall also

be liable to fine." The law prescribes the death penalty for those who are found guilty of blasphemy. The option of life imprisonment has been defunct since a 1991 Federal Shariat Court judg-


