## China stalling bid to defuse tension at LAC

#### Beijing yet to confirm date of upgraded military-level talks planned for this week

After agreeing to hold Jupgraded military-level talks this week, China is yet to confirm the date, stalling attempt to defuse the volatile situation prevailing at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Ladakh. The situation is so grim that the border saw at least four incidents of firing by


grim that the border saw at least four incidents of firing by the Indian and Chinese armies in the last 15 days.

Tension cooled down after extensive talks between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi on September 10. It was agreed there to continue the military and diplomatic-level talks. Sources said China was yet to inform India about the next date though they had agreed in principle to have the next round sometime this week.

With the Opposition seeking to know from the Government if China occupied any part of our land during repeated attempted transgression since May, the Defence Minister will make a statement on India-China issue in the Raiya Sabha on Thursday. This announcement came after a meeting chaired by the Defence Minister resolved that the Government will allow dis-

During the meeting,
Rajnath agreed to take one or

Holding a bilateral meeting at the political level in Moscow for the first time since the stand-off on the LAC in Eastern Ladakh started in May, Eastern Ladakh started in May, the two Foreign Ministers agreed on a five-point plan to disengage and de-escalate at the border. Since then relative peace prevailed with both the armies staying put at their positions on all the friction points.



As regards incidents of firing, sources said here on Wednesday the border witnessed four such episodes. This revelation came even as both the sides so far maintained that one incident had taken place on September 7. While Chinia had blamed India of opening fire, India flatly denied the accusation and held responsible Chinese troops for breaching the 45-year-old peace.

Giving the chronology of events, sources in the security two incidents took place on August 29 and 30 when the Indian troops thwarted a Chinese provocative action to advance into south bank of the Pangong Tso (lake).

took place there on September 7 when the belligerent Chinese troops fired warning shots in the air but the Indian Army maintained calm. This

#### No infiltration reported along India-China border in last 6 months, RS told

A gainst the backdrop of Althe massive troop buildup along the Line of Actual Control in Eastern Ladakh and several skirmishes between Chinas PLA and the Indian Army since May, the Centre on Wednesday informed the Rajya Sabba that "no infiltration has been reported along the Indian China border during the last six months."

Minister of State for Home

Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai said in a written reply that since February there had been 47 cases of attempted infiltration along the India-Pakistan border and added that "no infiltration has been reported along IndiaChina border during the last six months."

China border during the last six months."

BJP MP Anil Agarwal asked the Upper House in a written question whether it was a fact that cases of infiltration from Pakistan and China had increased in the last six months.

On Tuesday, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh informed the Lok Sabha that China had mobilised a large number of troops and arma-ment along the LAC as well as in the 'depth areas'. He said the LAC was not commonly delineated. Sinph said that in early

the LAC was not commonly delineated.

Singh said that in early May, the Chinese side took action to hinder the normal, traditional patrolling pattern of Indian troops in the Galwan valley area, causing a face-off.

However, MHA officials said the answer by Nityanand Rai is not in conflict with what Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has said. "Infiltration as terminology is associated with terrorists or action where a hostile element sneaks into our territory and moves to the hinterland," a senior official said.

MHA officials added that Defence Minister Rajnath Singh had also spoken about attempted transgressions by Chinese troops in his address to the Lok Sabha on Tuesday.

Anti-CAA WhatsApp groups used to trigger violence, says chargesheet

SHEKHAR SINGH NEW DELHI

The Special Cell of Delhi Police on Wednesday filed a The Special Cell of Delhi I Police on Wednesday filed a 17,500-page chargesheet against 15 people at Karkardooma court in a "larger conspiracy" case under the stringent anti terror law — Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act-related to the communal violence that broke out in February in the national Capital.

Police have so far arrested 21 people and 15 names mentioned in the chargesheet are based on scientific, documentary and testimonial evidence gathered during investigation. Police said the chargesheet against the remaining six names will be filed after collecting sufficient evidence and completing statutory and promade on September 2, after which the verdict was reserved. The special judge SK Yadav, who has retired but was on extension by the orders of the Supreme Court, has been asked by the SC to complete the formalities by September 30.

Advani, who recorded his statement on July 24, 2020 through video conferencing, had denied all charges of the CBI made against him on the conspiracy to demolish the Babri mosque structure.

### **Tata wins bid for new Parliament building** construction contract

Tata Projects Ltd has emerged as lowest bidder for the project to construct and maintain the new Parliament building for five years.

After the Central Public Works Department (CPWD) opened financial bids, on Wednesday, Tata Projects Ltd quoted a bid worth ₹861.90 crore, while Larsen and Toubro Ltd quoted 4865 crore. The bid document estimated the cost of the project at roughly ₹889 crore. Work on the building is likely to begin after the ongoing Monsoon Session of Parliament comes to an end.

According to the CPWD, three bidders had qualified in the technical round but only two firms ended up submitting their financial bids. Shapoorji



Pallonji & Company Private Limited was the third firms which qualified for financial bids for this project. "The contract is likely to be awarded to the lowest bidder.

## **Corruption in 12 DU colleges: Sisodia**

Delhi Deputy Chief Minister
Manish Sisodia has said
that 12 colleges of Delhi
University accused of not payjung the salaries of teachers, are
engaged in criminal activities
by hiding funds provided by
the Delhi Government.
Sisodia who also holds the
portfolio of Education in the
Delhi Cabinet alleged some
colleges were spending money
in lakhs of donations but not
paying salaries to teachers.
Addressing virtual conference with media, Sisodia said
the Delhi Government did a
special audit for these colleges.
Yesterday (Tleusday) we received
an initial report from the auditors. It was revealed that the colleges that were screaning about tors. It was revealed that the col-leges that were screaming about Delhi Government not provid-ing funds to them, have kept these funds under fixed deposits (FDs)". Sisodia said the colleges have enough funds in their FDs and other existing accounts yet the administration is not no prival seafures to its steff

accounts yet the administration is not paying salaries to its staff. CAG empanelled auditors have find it out in their initial observation report. This is almost criminal and totally unacceptable, he added. Citing documents of fund grants to 1.2 Delhi government aided colleges under Delhi University administration, Sisodia said his government has providedsufficient funds to the colleges for their projected providedsufficient funds to the colleges for their projected salary needs under the pattern of assistance. "College admin-istration should not become a pawn of their political masters



in BJP and should stop playing with the lives of their staff and students in these difficult

with the lives of their staff and students in these difficult times."

Sisodia pointed out a huge misappropriation in the accounts of the six DU colleges where Delhi government had initiated an independent audit.

"AAP government stands ogether with the teachers in this time of difficulty and it is important for everyone to understand how the DU administration has misman-aged funds given by Delhi Government. The Delhi Government. The Delhi Government thas provided enough funds to these colleges for paying the salaries but in hose funds are being directed elsewhere rather than paying the salaries to the teachers. Projected salaries for this ac-demic year is 300 crores and Delhi government has provide-ded sufficient funds to the col-Delhi government has provid-ed sufficient funds to the col-leges under the pattern of assis-tance," he said.

Sisodia said that both BJP and DU are playing politics on this matter, "Teachers are not getting their salaries despite the Delhi government providing timely graits, Few teachers came to meet me and shared their concerns about salary payment. They shared that there is a need of proper audit of the college funds and suspected that funds are diverted towards non-salary expenses. We wanted to get at the bottom of this, as there could be a case of fund misappropriation. Therefore, the Delhi government started a special audit of these colleges. We asked the names of the auditors from CAG and started the process of auditing these colleges from CAG empanelled auditors. In the first week of September, six colleges were audited by them. Yesterday, we received an initial observation report from the auditors and some shocking revelations have come out", he said.

Sisodia said, when I took up this issue of non-payment of

salaries, I found that the salary grants for these colleges were progressively increased over the past few years. In the last five years, the grants to these colleges have almost been dou-bled.<sup>b</sup>

He pointed out that Keshaw Mahavidyalaya has 10.52 crores INR as fixed deposit. He questioned that if they have so much money, why are they not paying salaries to their teachers.

"The salary grant paid by Delhi government to Keshav Mahavidyalaya was 10.92 crores INR in the year 2014-15 and last year the government paid 27.9 crores INR. Within five years, their salary grants have almost tripled. Even after receiving so much amount, they are not paying salaries to their teachers"

currently they have around 2.5
crores INR as fixed deposits in

The salary grant paid to Bhagini Nivedita in the year 2014-15 was around 8.4 crores INR and last year it was increased to 18 crores INR. its surprising that they are claiming lack of funds and at the same time not consenting.

He said, "Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies didn't even provide their audited balance sheets to the auditors. However, it was found that they had around 3.5 crores INR in their balance sheet in year 2018-19. On top INR in fixed deposits. Ever after having close to 14 crore INR with them, Delhi univer

INR with them, Delhi university and college administration is blaming Delhi government for not providing funds. This is highly unacceptable.

As the auditors started asking more questions around the fund utilisation and fixed deposits, the college administration stopped co-operating with the auditors. It was also found that there is no audit done on the fees collected by the students under different heads.

### Decomposing can solve stubble burning, says Rai



With an aim to save the people from the health hazards caused by deteriorated air quality due to stubble burning in the neighboring States, the Delhi Gowernment will speak to the Centre and neighboring States of Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, and Haryana regarding implementing the initiative to decompose stubble and using it in the farming fields, Delhi Environment Minister Gopal Rai said on Wednesday.

The cost of spraying of compost in Delhi will be borne by the Delhi Government to ease the burden on the farmers, as iasid, adding that the Delhi Government is committed to develop a sustainable and effective solution to the issue of stubble burning which causes major pollution in Delhi especially during the winter season.

"The process of decomposing stubble and using it in the farming fields will be a great initiative. The Delhi govern-

ment will speak to the Centre and states to implement this initiative and the cost of spraying of this compost in Delhi will be borne by the Delhi government which will ease the burden on the farmers, he added.

Addressing the media following his visit to Pusa Agriculture Institute, Gopal Rai said that the air quality in Delhi becomes very dangerous during the winter season.

"Last year, the stubble burning comprised 44 per cent of Delhi's pollution apart from Delhi's own share of pollutants. In Punjab, around 20 million tonnes of stubble was burned in Punjab.

In Haryana, around seven million tonnes of stubble was burned last year, due to which 1.23 million tonnes of stubble was burned last year, due to which people of Delhi had to suffer from major pollution last year, "he said. Rai said that the central government has devised a

scheme in which aid is provided to the farmers for stubble. "The farmers have to pay half of the money and the rest of the thalf will be paid by the government for a machine that is required for the process," he said. The environment minister said, "I met the director of Pusa Agricultural Institute, who said that they have developed a Agricultural Institute, who said that they have developed a recomposing technology which can turn stubble into manure, which can be used in the fields itself."

"I believe that the same amount of money that is spent on the purchase of machines and on subsidy can be used for the decomposing of the stubble in those states. This will be a very successful initiative by the governments," he said.

The contagion of the novel Coronavirus (Covid-19) virus is continuing to spread with frightening speed in Uttarakhand. On Wednesday Uttarakhand. On Wednesday 1540 fresh cases of the disease were reported by the state health department which is the second highest number in a single day. On Sunday ( September 13) record 1637 cases of Covid-19 were report-ed. With these cases the tally of the disease has galloped to 35947 in the state. Meanwhile, experts have opined that lockdown on weekends will not decrease the chances of Covid-19 contagion but it will surely give a false assurance to people when they need to be more alert. According to doctor Nitin Pandey, imposing a strict lockdown on weekends is not going to save anybody from the con-200 μης με a strict lock-down on weekend sis not going to save anybody from the con-tagion. Proper protective mea-sures are more important for safety from Covid. He said that imposing lockdown on week-ends is completely impractical and unscientific. #### NCB seizes 2 kgs of charas, arrests 2 peddlers from Palghar

Mounting its crackdown on the drug peddlers in and around the metropolis, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) officials on Wednesday seized 2.04 kg of Charas (weed) and arrested two peddlers from the neighbouring Palghar district.

Identifying the arrested alleged drug peddlers as Avinash Arun Singh (24) Shravan L. Gupta (38), the NCB officials said that both Avinash and Gupta were residents of Nalasopara in Palghar district.

Acting on a tip-off, a Mumbai Zonal NCB team apprehended Avinash and found the narcotics hidden in a backpack on his person.

Gupta had been in touch with Avinash earlier for delivery of a bag containing Charas received from an alleged supplier Baltram alias Balli, a resident of Bhayander (east) in Thane district.

The NCB officials said that the seized contraband was found in eight taped packets sewn in cloth bags. The bags were concealed in Avinash's backpack.

The NCB officials are investigating the antecedents of the arrested accused, the source and destination of the seized drugs and the supply chain involved.

### Pak renews map war

Despite Russia's protests, it circulates fictitious map showing parts of India at SCO. Is China behind this adventurism?



akistan is playing a dangerous geo-political game, needling India from the other end as China's serf State, without realising that all of it could boomerang on itself. Having failed to internationalise the Kashmir issue despite the abrogation of Article 370, it has now taken its territorial aggression to redrav ing its maps and appropriating what it fancifully feels is owed to it. So in August it released a new map, incorporating Kashmir, parts of Ladakh and Junagadh in Gujarat. India had rightly called this vacuous and unilateral declaration, which is not backed by any cred-

ible reasoning, support groups, historical reasoning or legal validity, as a "political absurdity." So Pakistan, in a bid to legitimise its claims, circulated this map at a virtual meeting of the national security advisors of Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) member countries, despite host Russia's resistance. India rightly walked out of the meeting, saying Pakistan's move violated SCO norms, which mandated that no bilateral issue would be discussed and that the sovereignty and territorial integrity of member-states would be respected. The Russia-India-China axis dominates the SCO, which, as a counterweight to the US-dominated NATO, has emerged as one of the largest trans-regional international organisations accounting for almost 44 per cent of the world population, stretching from the Arctic Ocean to the Indian Ocean and from the Pacific Ocean to the Baltic Sea. China is seeking to use it in its global domination against the US and while it has sufficiently debt-trapped Central Asian republics and other regional players to do its bidding, it is trying to neutralise Russia by becoming its biggest investor and is now needling India. Considering that India is intransigent on yielding to China's terms on the Ladakh standoff, regardless of the meetings of the Foreign and Defence Ministers of both nations on the sidelines of the SCO, it just wanted to embarrass India, making it look like an "occupier" at a public forum. And for this it used its proxy, Pakistan. China has also been trying to convince Russia to scale down its defence deals with India following the border standoff and the map fiasco, which undoubtedly has left Moscow red-faced, was about strong-arming it as well. True, Russia is pragmatic enough about keeping both China and India on its side to establish its relevance in a multi-polar world and even front India to counter Chinese heft. But China certainly doesn't want India, which has won brownie points at international fora for being decorous and respecting the rule of law, to prevail at SCO. In fact, it was what Pakistan Foreign Minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi said recently that shows this cartographic offensive to be a part of a larger pattern and not just Pakistan's independent move. "The new map shows Kashmir shares a clear border with China," a clear indication that like Nepal, this attempt to redraw boundaries was made at China's behest and underlines our eastern neighbour's desire for strategic contiguity in the region than Pakistan's any real concern for Kashmir. While India is firm on Chinese withdrawal from eastern Ladakh that seems to have driven a wedge in their greater plan to control the Karakoram by squeezing us with salami-slicing, Pakistan's map claims are clearly intended to warn us of a two-front offensive. Pakistan is heating up the Line of Control (LoC), having moved almost 20,000 soldiers recently to match Chinese deployment on the Line of Actual Control (LAC). Its ceasefire violations and infiltration bids have gone up by about 60 per cent this year, something which didn't happen even after the Balakot airstrikes. If recent reports are to be believed, then the Chinese are no longer shadow-boxing. Just like in Nepal, their officials have had a series of meetings with their Pakistani counterparts in Gilgit-Baltistan and have been aiding them clandestinely to revive old terror networks against India. Debt-trapped by the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), with its economy in the doldrums and heavily dependent on borrow-ings and bailouts, Pakistan is but a pawn in China's gameplan. Yet Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan forgets that such unilateralism will beget

unilateralism from the Indian side as well. And hurt its interests. The new map is nothing but an adventurist version of its 1947-48 map and in one blow scythes through all bilateral agreements that came after it, primarily the 1972 Shimla Agreement. If Khan wants to negate the understanding that bilateral disputes will be resolved bilaterally, is he also prepared for the negation of all other bilateral treaties we have regarding water-sharing? And if he has taken the liberty of depicting territories under Indian control as Pakistani territory, then how would he counter other valid land claims from our side? In that sense, Pakistan's latest offensive is nothing short of playing with fire. Realising that the US is now more an ally of India and is humouring it, Pakistan is desperately coopting the Kashmir issue under the banner of pan-Islamism. So it is involving Turkey, which wants to be a leader of the neo-Islamic world, in its criticism of India and seeking Chinese endorsement. Only Pakistan doesn't realise that its Kashmir strategy is still not quite exportable. And that China, while using it for posturing, will continue to engage with India for geo-strategic reasons.

### **Life on Venus**

There's proof of life in the unlikeliest of planets, also known for being one of the least explored



or years, the search for extraterrestrial life inside our solar system has always concentrated on the "red" planet Mars. That is because Mars is similar in size to Earth. There is now clear evidence that there was once water on its surface and most importantly, like Earth, it is also in the so-called "habitable" zone, close enough to its star for enough radiation but not so much that life wouldn't take off. Mars is, therefore, considered to either have life or to have once harboured life and capable of supporting a human expedition. As a result, we are constantly sending probes to Mars and even to its tiny moons.

Probes that circle the planet as well as robotic vehicles

that have roamed its surface. We actually have a greater grasp of the surface of Mars than we do of the bottom of our oceans. Even now, the aim for mankind, both in real and

reel life, is to make Mars the first step on our eventual voyage to the stars. Venus, the second rock from the Sun, is, however, given as an example of where global warming will take us. A planet benign on the outside but one where every probe sent since the start of space exploration has been dissolved in acid in the atmosphere or fried by the extreme heat that the greenhouse effect has caused. Even though the Soviet Venera programme did land several probes on Venus and many survived a few hours, there was a succession of lens cap failures. As a result, Venus is one of the least explored planets of the solar system, lacking the romanticism of Mars and the grandeur of Jupiter and Saturn, which have both seen billion-dollar spacecraft visit them in the past decade. Yet, the discovery of phosphine in the Venusian atmosphere is an intriguing prospect because the only way for this gas, with three hydrogen molecules attached to one phosphorus molecule, to occur naturally is as a byproduct of biological processes. While the gas can be made industrially by man, that isn't clearly a possibility on Venus. So, have we been barking up the wrong tree for decades? After all, as the old adage goes, "Men are from Mars and Women are from Venus" and as we all know, women have all the answers. Maybe some strange process creates phosphine on Venus that we are unaware of and we should send a probe or two to the planet we never thought could harbour life. But as we know from Earth herself, life can survive in some really extreme conditions. This time though, let us make sure that the lens caps work.

Teaching and learning shall become more interactive, and much would transpire outside the closed classroom. Skill development and bringing in vocational education elements early in

schools would require TEIs absorbing them in their own curricula. Those who know the story of Richard Feynman would find it much easier to visualise its great transformative and inspiring impact on the system as a whole. It would be possible only when the promises to ensure the assured recruitment process are put to practice, and the assurances on the professionally acceptable teacher-student ratio is implemented without any aberrations. One must not ignore aberrations. One must not ignore considerable dilution in the qual-ity of education and decline in the acceptability and credibility of schools funded by the public. The

schools would require TEIs

icy realises this. The ancient Indian tradition policy realises this.

It is the comprehension of these basic principles that has led to the restricting of the school education system to \$+3+3+4\*. The most significant is the addition of initial three years, after the age of 3. India would need very specialised teachers for this age group.

A couple of years ago, India danticipated the importance of open and distance learning. That experience comes very handy as the global attention diverts to online learning. Creation of digital platforms and e-content had already begun in full swing and has come handy during the corona crisis, as children are confined to their homes. The pedagogy is undergoing unprecedented change, teachers associated with schools will have to gear up to learn new skills. While tools and techniques shall to gear up to learn new skills.

- Inflation is primarily dri Sir — Inflation is primarily dri-ven by food prices, which account for 39 per cent of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) basket, and a sharp spiral in prices of transport and commu-nication services, which amount

to 8.6 per cent. The sub category of petrol and diesel for vehi-des and telephone charges for nobelies account for around 50 per cent of transport and com-munication charges, which have been growing in double digits in July and August. Prices of basic food items such as pulses, wegeta-bles, edible oil, meat, fish and

eggs have doubled. Even fruits are extremely costly. While the CPI in August is lower than that of July by 0.04 per cent, it is still higher than the upper limit of the RBIs comfort level of six per cent for the fifth consecutive month. The data is not at all encouraging.

## The pleasures of victimhood

If impersonating was Jessica Krug's way of legitimising herself as an academic, mobilising the disenfranchised and then representing them as perpetual victims is another

The recent confession of Professor Jessica Krug about her true identity may have outraged many. However, it offers an opportunity to re-evaluate what academics given to conscious-mess-raising offen do. Krug, a historian teaching African history at George Washington University, admitted in a blog that she is a lew born of White parents and has nothing to do with African-American Blackness something which she had been claiming for a long time. She regretted that her action was 'the very epitome of violence, of thievery and appropriation, of the myriad ways in which non-Black people continue to use and abuse Black identities and cultures. In the same breath, Krug declared that she is no culture utulure but culture leech. Her actions though have proved otherwise. Prior to her outing of herself in the blog, Krug had used a more African-sounding name (Jessica La Bombalera) in her activist avatar, and during a demonstration had questioned the gentrification of New York by calling out the "White New Yorkers." for having failed to spare a thought for Black and Brown New Yorkers. We don't know what prompted her to come out as White though it is said that there were increasing nurmurs about her identity that forced her to do so.

The knowledge market: On the face of it, a situation such as this is not representative of the cachemic environment in the US or India. This is where the present intervention marks its departure. Krug's admission, no doubt, betrays her inability to fake it any longer, but more importantly, it reveals the malasies of contemporary academic knowledge production. The difference between usurping the voice of the weak (what academics do) and pretending to be the weak (what Krug did) is perhaps one of degree and not of kind. When Krug claimed to be a culture leech rather than a vulture, he was high-tighting that subtle difference. We can be reasonably sure that Krug is not the first one and wont be helast, at least until the academic market stops converting experience of marginality to ellist knowledge and suspends placing a premium on the dish of victimhood.

Those who see Krug's problem as an individual transgression are either oblivious of what goes in the name of knowledge or are beneficiaries of such methods. Academic scholarship has often been obsessed with not just representing cultural difference but also in producing, controlling and ownight. The control of such knowledge, it is taken for granted that ir cultural difference does not exist, it is to be invented and if academic knowledge has to sustain itself, savage slofs are to be continuously filled Krug took it one step further. Instead of being content with immersion or academic self-othering, or sponging on cultural difference of the Blacks like a leech, she took to become indistinguishable from what she was writing about.

A few years ago, Harvard University had gone to the market advertising its culture of diversity by projecting Elizabeth Warren, a law professor who claimed to be a Cherokee Indian (and went on to have a thriving political career). The difference between birth identity and assumed identity may appear as academically adventurous and a cool way of moving beyond fixed identities, but in reality, and for the people whose identities, but in reality, and for the people whose identity is thus stolen, it is an act of violence. In a post-modern academic world, race is increasingly seen as a political invention rather

Muslim or Dallt in India. Cultural difference and victimhood are a minefield of fame and mone.

That said, the demonstrations over the death of George Floyd or over atrocities against Dallts reveal a mindset of remembering the victim only when they can be used as a medium of accumulating symbolic capital. It is not just about dehumanising and instrumentalising them for advancing ones career but also the belief that being a victim pays. The willingness to barter away ones identity, as Krug did, springs from the conviction that academic benefit from such impersonation out-weighs the losses.

Imaginary victims: What Krug did not acknowledge in her confession is that her violence was not only directed as gen-uine Black experience but also at White experience. While faking to be Black, she was creating a template in white Whiteness is antagonists to Blackness and so was perpetuating a race binary. She reducing her own race by making it appear inflexible, intolerant, exclusivist and the negation of Black experience. Her imper-sonation implied that sincere appreciation

of Black history is not possible while being White. She also pandered to those radical elements who believe that genuite understanding of the other is possible only by denying one's own authenticity. Her pretension perpetuated the academic world of make-believe that being majority is a matter of shame and its disavowal or degradation is necessary to speak for the weak.

Krug converted the Black experience
to some bare codes defining Black authenticity: Angry, violent, absuse: That is what
she was doing while appearing as Jessica.

La Bombalera. The resonance of this mentality in India is not difficult to find. Dalits
and Muslims are often projected in the
media as angry and violent because that
is the only way to be weak and a minority. Being helpless and being violent are the
expressions of the same authentic core.
Academics like Krug not only stereotype
or steal identity, they also create norms
which guide wictimhood. As long as the
Black man is anti-polic or a Muslim is
anti-State or a Dalit is anti-Brahmin, they
are authentic; a republican AfricanAmerican is beyond this template as is a
antionalist Indian Muslim.

An academic from Hunter Colleg
named Yarimar Bonilla said something
very revealing about Krug, that the latter
to only fooled others about being a

their being, their worth outside her own

What it reveals is that being a victim of violence has more moral, academic and perhaps political worth than being normal and majority. So behind minority identity, its production and circulation, there is a political economy of cultural difference and of wiersity that can be a passport to capital — economic or symbolic. Becoming the other involves alile-time of dedication to live another life. Krug must have internalised the new identity. In the acknowl-

edgment section of her book Fugitive Modernities, she thanked her "ancestors,

Modernities, she thanked her "ancestors, unknown, unamed, who bled life into a future they had no reason to believe could or should exist. ... Those whose names I cannot say for their own safety, whether in my barrio, in Angola, or in Brazil." It may be mentioned here that Krug had received financial assistance for writing this book from Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture.

It is not important to know whether being White or feigning Blackness is better for being a scholar of African history. What is important is the knowledge itself—of victims and minority. ### Why the double standards on demolition of holy places?

Will the global Muslim community raise its voice for the restoration of the holiest of Islam's revered sites that were destroyed by the Wahhabis?



Masjid in Ayodhya was demolished on December 6, 1992 by a Hindu mob, mostly comprising diehard Kar Sevaks (volunteers) of the Vishwa Hindu Parishad led by Sangh Parivar leaders. ### **PAK 'EPICENTRE OF** TERRORISM': INDIA

Persecutes Hindus, Sikhs, Christians. savs India at Geneva; slams OIC, Turkey, Pakistan over Kashmir

Describing Pakistan as an "epicenter of terrorism", India has said that no one deserves an unsolicited lecture on human rights from Islamabad that has consistently persecuted its ethnic and religious minorities including Hindus, Sikhs and Christians. Exercising the Right of Reply to the statements made by Pakistan at the 45th session of the Human Rights Council (HRC) here, the Indian representative on Tuesday said that it has become habitual for Pakistan to malign India with false and fabricated narratives for its self-serving malicious purposes. purposes.
"Neither India nor others deserve

his mether india nor others deserve this unsolicited lecture on human rights from a country that has consis-tently persecuted its ethnic and reli-gious minorities, is an epicenter of ter-rorism, has the distinction of provid-ing pensions to individuals on UN Sanctions list and has a Prime Minister who, proudly admits training tens of who proudly admits training tens of thousands of terrorists to fight in Jammu & Kashmir," the Indian diplo-mat said.

It was not surprising that other rel-evant multilateral institutions have

evant multilateral institutions have been raising serious concerns on Pakistan's failure to stop terror financ-ing and lack of effective actions against all terror entities in Pakistan, India said. Highlighting the nefarious designs of Pakistan in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (Pok), it said, 'the mass influx of outsiders has whittled down the number of Kashmiris to an insignifi-cant number in Pakistan occupied parts of Indian Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh'. "In its zeal to reassert its theocratic

Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh".

"In its zeal to reassert its theocratic ideology, it (Pakistan) has ensured that ethnic and religious minorities have no future through systematic persecution, blasphemy laws, forced conversions,

targeted killings, sectarian violence and faith-based discrimination," India said.
Thousands of Sikh, Hindu and Christian minority women and girls have been subjected to abductions, forced marriages and conversions in Pakistan, it said.
On the plight of people in

Pakistan, it said.
On the plight of people in Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh, India said, "Not a single day has gone by when a family in Balochistan doesn't find its members

has gone by when a family in Balochistan doesn't find its members picked up or kidnapped by the secutivity forces of Pakistan."

"Pakistan does well when it comes to intimidation and attacks against journalists, human rights defenders and political dissidents in particular by its state machinery. It is not without a reason that Pakistan has been highlighted by international organisation as a country where journalists are slain and their killers go scot free," India sates, and India also slammed Pakistan for "abusing various HRC mechanisms and platforms for raising issues, which are extraneous to the mandate of the HRC and which relate to the internal affairs of India, with a view to distract the attention of the internal community from serious human rights via clations committed by it against is own

the attention of the international com-munity from serious human rights vio-lations committed by it against its own people, including in Indian territories occupied by it."

India also rejected the reference made by the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) to Jammu & Kashmir, which is an integral part of India. "The OIC has no locus standi to comment on internal affairs of India. The OIC has allowed itself to be mis-used by Pakistan to subverse its own Agenda. It's for the members of the OIC to decide if it is in their interests to allow Pakistan to do so; it said. India also advised Turkey to refrain from commenting on its inter-nal affairs and develop a better under-standing of the democratic practices.

#### He's taking something: Trump accuses Biden of using drugs

US President Donald Trump, in his latest shredding of political niceties, suggested Tuesday that his Democratic opponent Joe Biden has taken drugs to improve his performance in debates. 
