## VISTARA TO OFFER IN-FLIGHT WIFI ON DREAMLINER FROM TODAY

Vistara will offer in-flight WiFi services on its Boeing 787-9 Dreamliner aircraft, which are currently being used to operate Delhi-London flights, from Friday onwards, the private carrier said on Thursday. In a press release, the airline said: "As an introductory offer, the service will be available free of cost to all Vistara customers for a limited period." Vistara is the first Indian airline to offer in-flight wifi services. The carrier said it plans to introduce the WiFi services on its Airbus A321neo plane as well, subject to regulatory approvals. The airline has two Dreamliner aircraft in its fleet and both of those are being used to operate Delhi-London flights currently.



## UNION HOME MINISTER AMIT SHAH DISCHARGED FROM AIIMS

Union Home Minister Amit Shah, who recently recovered from COVID-19 and was admitted to AIIMS for a complete medical checkup, was discharged on Thursday evening, officials said. He was admitted to the premier hospital on September 12. The home minister has been discharged from AIIMS, an official said. Earlier in the day, Shah had addressed an event in his constituency Gandhinagar in Gujarat through video conference. On August 2, Shah, 55, had said on Twitter that he had tested positive for COVID-19. He had undergone treatment at Medanta Hospital and was discharged after he recovered from the disease.



## PULWAMA-TYPE ATTACK AVERTED WITH RECOVERY OF 52 KG EXPLOSIVES

A Pulwama-style terror attack was averted on Thursday by the Indian Army with the recovery of 52 kg of explosives in Karewa area of Gadiak in Kashmir, Army officials said here. The location where the explosives were recovered was near a national highway and close to the site of last year's Pulwama terror attack that had killed 40 CRPF personnel, they said. "We have averted another Pulwama-type attack," said an Army official. According to the officials, the explosives were found in a water tank in the area during a search operation around 8 AM.



## B'WOOD SUPPORTS URMILA AFTER KANGANA 'SOFT PORN STAR' COMMENT

# Judiciary biased against AP govt, Vijayasai says in RS

AP facing not only financial troubles but also judicial, MP says on gag order

YSRCP general secretary and parliamentary party leader V Vijayasai Reddy on Thursday stated that Andhra Pradesh has been facing not only financial but also judicial troubles.

Vijayasai Reddy raised in Rajya Sabha the issue of the Andhra Pradesh High Court issuing an order allegedly gagging the media from reporting on an FIR lodged against a former A-G along with 12 others.

Questioning the legitimacy of the order on the floor of the House, Vijayasai Reddy pointed out that the same order also went onto enforce a stay on the investigation being carried out by the ACB.

During a discussion on Covid, the senior YSRCP leader said: "The court has taken some quite unusual and legally questionable decisions. The state is suffering not only financially but also judicially. A quite unusual and legally questionable decision has been taken in the interim order of the AP HC, imposing a ban on media and social media from mentioning anything related to a FIR filed by the police against the former Advocate-General of the police and others."

## Stay on SIT probe not in spirit of Constitution: Botsa

Municipal Administration Minister Botsa Satyanarayana on Thursday said the stay on the SIT probe was not in tune with the spirit of natural justice and the Constitution.

Speaking to the media here, he said the interim order staying the investigations by a Special Investigation Team (SIT) set

up by the Government to investigate irregularities into projects started by the previous TDP government between 2014 and 2019 was unfair. In democracy, there have been instances of Prime Ministers, Chief Ministers and Ministers being named and tried by courts, he pointed out.

The Minister said it was N Chandrababu Naidu, Nara

Lokesh and other TDP leaders who exploited farmers in Amaravati region.

YSRCP had raised the issue while it was in Opposition, Botsa said, adding that the incumbent would probe the irregularities of the previous government on assuming office.

"Government has been probing the corruption and irregularities of the previous regime in a fair," he said.

# Harsimrat quits Union Cabinet over Centre's Bills for farmers

In a major setback to the Modi government, Shiromani Akali Dal president Sukhbir Singh Badal on Thursday announced in the Lok Sabha that Harsimrat Kaur Badal will resign from the Union Cabinet in protest against the three farm Bills, tabled in Parliament by the Centre for passage.

In his speech during a discussion on two of the farm Bills — the Farmers Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Bill and the Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill — Sukhbir Singh Badal said the proposed laws will "destroy" the 50 years of hard work put in by successive Punjab governments and



farmers to build the agriculture sector.

He recalled Punjab's massive contribution in making India self-sufficient in food grain production as he vehemently opposed the bills.

"I want to make an announcement that our Minister Harsimrat Kaur Badal will resign from Cabinet," he said in concluding remarks.


He also refuted suggestions

that his party initially supported three ordinances, which these Bills seek to replace, and asserted that Harsimrat Kaur Badal had expressed her concerns in the Cabinet meeting and also wrote to Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar, highlighting "flaws" in the proposed legislations.

Hitting out at the Congress, which has sought to corner the SAD over these bills, he accused the party of "double speak" on the issue and noted that the abolition of the APMC Act was part of its manifesto in both the 2019 Lok Sabha election and the 2017 Assembly polls in Punjab.

The Shiromani Akali Dal is the BJP's oldest ally and has stood by the saffron party through thick and thin.

## IMD forecasts 'very heavy' rain for 2 days

The India Meteorological Department has forecast fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy falls very likely over Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Kerala, Goa and parts of Maharashtra and Karnataka during the next two days.

Under the influence of likely low pressure area over northeast Bay of Bengal and consequent strengthening of lower level winds along the west coast, the IMD said.

## Amaravati Capital location was never a secret, says TDP

Telugu Desam Party former MLA Bonda Umamaheswara Rao on Thursday demanded YSRCP Ministers and MPs to explain why the party did not object to the declaration of Amaravati as the Capital of Andhra Pradesh when the decision was taken by the previous TDP regime.

Bonda asserted that the final decision on Amaravati was transparent and was taken with due consideration given to the suggestions made by the Sivaramakrishnan Committee at that time as per the terms and conditions laid down by

the Central Government. Addressing a press conference here, the TDP leader said that there was no secrecy about the declaration of Amaravati Capital during the TDP regime but now the YSRCP Government has taken a U-Turn and was bent upon destroying it out of sheer greed and political vendetta.

"In media owned or supportive of the YSRCP, there were reports at that time that Vijayawada was the best place for location of Capital. Even the national media carried

reports on the capital being located between Vijayawada and Guntur. It was not correct on the part of the YSRCP Ministers now to talk badly about Amaravati and the great historic tradition it has got," Bonda said.

He accused the YSRCP leaders of harbouring ulterior motives to perpetrate and continue their multiple scams and mafia activities in sand, liquor, land and water resources all over the State.

"They want to shift the capital to Visakhapatnam only

to make sure that the values of the lands they already acquired there spike multiple times. The YSRCP top leaders have acquired over 30,000 acres in the surroundings of the port city. While the TDP planned to develop Amaravati into a big city like Hyderabad, the Jagan regime is destroying AP Capital for the sake of creating wealth for a few YSRCP leaders," the TDP MLA said. He deplored that the YSRCP Ministers were spreading lies and betraying all sections of the people even as their misdeeds have pushed the State into a financial crisis.

# State crosses 6 lakh Covid infections mark

Andhra Pradesh takes 170 days to reach zero to six lakh cases; just 20 more days to add two lakh more to the tally

Andhra Pradesh on Thursday breached the six-lakh mark Covid-19 cases after it reported 8,702 new infections, taking the tally to 6,01,462, becoming the second state in the country after Maharashtra to record over six lakh cases. Meanwhile, the toll reached 5,177 after 72 patients died in the last 24 hours.

The number of recoveries in the state crossed the five-lakh mark on Thursday after 10,712 patients being cured of the virus in the past 24 hours.

However, the active Covid-19 cases now stand at 88,197 as the state has been consistently reporting more daily recover-



ies than the fresh cases. The total number of recoveries in AP stood at 5,08,088 with a recovery rate of 84.47 percent.

Also, 77,492 samples were tested in the state in the past 24 hours, pushing the total number to 48.84 lakh. AP ranks

fourth in terms of the number of samples tested behind Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, and Maharashtra.

East Godavari continued to report the highest number of Covid-19 cases in the state as the district registered 1,383

new cases on Thursday. West Godavari district reported 1,064 cases and Chittoor district 905. With 526 new cases, Vizianagaram district crossed 30,000 mark Covid-19 cases to 30,029 on Thursday.

By Thursday morning, the state had tested 91,468 samples per million persons, more than double the national average of 43,667 tests. The state's positivity rate stands at 12.31 per cent, above the national average of 8.45 per cent.

AP reported its first Covid-19 case on March 12 and by July 27, the state had already breached the one-lakh mark. On August 7, AP crossed the two-lakh mark and by August 18 it had already reported

three lakh cases. On August 28, Andhra's Covid-19 cases rose to four lakh and on September 7, the tally rose to five lakh. It took just 10 days for the tally to add one lakh more cases.

While Prakasam has the highest number of active cases with 12,411 persons still under treatment in hospitals and home isolation, East Godavari has the highest number of recoveries of 69,939.

Out of 5,177 total casualties in the state, Chittoor accounts for 564, Guntur 481, East and Godavari 472. With the fresh 10 Covid-19 deaths, Prakasam district breached 400 mark to 405 and similarly the death toll in Srikakulam touched 300 on Thursday.

## Jealous teenager drown neighbour's baby in tank

The Srikakulam police on Thursday cracked the murder case of 11-month-old girl, M. Hemasree (Ramyasree), whose body was found on September 4 in the water tank of a house at Turakasasanam village under Baruva police station in Srikakulam district.

The police investigation revealed that the murder was committed by a 15-year-old relative who is also the neighbour. The teenaged girl had dropped the baby in the water tank in her house.

Hemasree was the only daughter of M. Duryodhana and M. Kayva. Duryadhana works in Chennai while Kayva, along with her daugh-

ter, lived with her in-laws at Turakasasanam village.

On September 4, the baby's mother found the baby missing and informed the same to the baby's family. After two hours of frantic search, the baby was found in the water tank at the teen's house.

Sub-Inspector G. Narayana Swami said that though it was clear that it was a murder as baby wouldn't have climbed the terrace and then jump into the water tank, they could not get any clues to solve the case.

"Our investigation has revealed that the accused used to visit Hemasree's house and also used to steal money in small amounts and other things," the S-I said.



## Panel to probe disappearance of lion statues from Durga temple

Minister for Endowments Velampalli Srinivasa Rao formed a departmental committee to probe into the missing of the three silver plated lion statues that adorn the chariot of the Kanakadurga temple atop Indrakeeladri in Vijayawada.

The incident comes close on the heels of the chariot burning in Antarvedi. After visiting the temple, the minister told the media that temple staff found the statues missing and later alerted the management. "We have to see if the lions are missing now, or earlier," he said.

The chariot, used only on special occasions, was placed at



the Mahamandapam on the foothills of the temple. The four sides of the chariot is adorned with a silver lion, made up of three kilograms of silver, and of them three are missing, while the fourth one has some damages on it.

The 62-year-old wooden chariot at the famous Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy temple at Antarvedi in East Godavari district was gutted in a mysterious fire in the wee hours of the intervening night of September 5 and 6.

## Chicken prices spiral up again after Covid blow

PNS ■ VISAKHAPATNAM

The demand and supply gap has spiraled up the broiler chicken in the state. The poultry businessmen predict that the prices of chicken will further increase.

The dressed broiler chicken was being sold at Rs 230 per kg. For the second time in 2020, chicken prices have touched above Rs 230 a kg in major cities in the state.

In the first half of this year when the rumours fanned out that Covid-19 could spread through the consumption of chicken, the demand for chicken drastically fell. Due to that, the poultry businessmen incurred huge losses and they had to sell chicken at throw-

away prices.

As a result, majority poultry businessmen have stopped the production of chicks and the impact is being felt. However the demand for the chicken has increased from mid-April as many suggested chicken will improve the immunity. Now, the demand has increased by 30 per cent more than the normal demand in the first week of September, said M Janaki Rao, one of the poultry businessmen in the Vizag region.

The average demand of the chicken meat is around eight lakh kgs per day in the state but now the demand has increased to over 10 lakh kgs per day in August. However, the supply of broiler chicken has come down to seven lakh kg per day in the

state. The prices will further increase in the coming days as it will take at least two more

months to supply the birds to meet the demand, Rao, added. Similarly, mutton prices have

been fluctuating from Rs 700 to Rs 800 a kg depending on the quality.

# AP scores 'zero' against Gujarat

Once closely competing with the top most leading states to create a vibrant start-up ecosystem, Andhra Pradesh has performed relatively poor in the latest annual state start-up ranking, scoring 'zero' in some parameters in comparison to Gujarat.

Out of the seven parameters, AP has relatively scored zero in three domains: Incubation Support, Seed Funding and Venture Funding support. Gujarat and Andaman have scored 100 per cent in these three parameters.

With the change of guard in the state in 2019, the start-up ecosystem has received least attention due to the transition phase and also the Covid pandemic. The incubators set up by the government at various places are not functional. Also, the startups also agreed to the performance score given by the Union government lamenting the poor condition of the start-up ecosystem in the state.

According to Minister for IT Mekapati Goutham Reddy, the State government is planning to set up an incubator like T-hub in Telangana bringing the reputed IT companies under one roof. Andhra was in 'Leader' category in the state start-up ranking-2018. However, it has witnessed a dramatic fall in the ranking slipping to the Emerging Sector.

The states scoring 100% are the 'Best Performers' while fetching more than 75% is top performers. And, scoring between 30% and 75% is Leader and if the performance is below 30% it is called Aspiring Leader and below

10% is Emerging ones.

Expressing disappointment over the poor performance of Andhra, Alok, who has been promoting start-up culture in the city, and conducting a workshop, said "It is really disheartening. From being a state, which was one of the initial states to launch a start-up policy to a situation now where we are standing in line with states, which have started to focus on startups only recently. I believe this time feedback of the startups has got more importance than last year."

The relative performance of Andhra Pradesh in each of the seven domains is decided in comparison to the perfor-

mance of the best states (Gujarat and Andaman) in the corresponding ones. The department has given the AP government several suggestions. Increasing partnerships to strengthen incubation support and identifying additional educational institutes for setting up of new incubators and offer financial support to meet the capital and operating expenditure incurred to set up and run incubation facilities.

Incubators produce vibrant start-up ecosystem: NRDC. Stressing the need of incubator/accelerator facilities, the NRDC's Technology Innovation Support Centre

(TISC), Manager (Vizag), Dr Bijay Kumar Sahu, commented that AP is a great entrepreneurial state and incubators would rightly complement it to build the start-up ecosystem.

Currently, only NRDC, Vizag, is providing mentorship to startups and connecting them to the required technology and also investors. Other state run incubators under AP Innovation Society are not functional.

"Incubator gives wings to the innovative idea and also ensures that it turns into a product. We chose tech startups with potential product ideas and also help them not to copy products that are already in the market with patents, Intellectual Property rights," he said.

"NRDC also connects the startups to the right technology under its technology transfer programme. We also help the startups in proto-type development, field testing, market research, seed funding besides protecting their IP Rights," he elaborated.

"This can be attributed to the detrimental effect that the pandemic has had where the technological advancement was not up to date," the report said.

It further added that "Indian cities have suffered more from the pandemic because they were not prepared".

From 15 indicators that the respondents perceive as the priority areas for their city, all four cities highlighted air pollution as one of the key areas that they felt their city needed to prioritise on.

For cities like Bangalore and Mumbai, this was closely followed by road congestion while for Delhi and Hyderabad it was basic amenities, the report said.

The 2020 Smart City Index (SCI) was topped by Singapore, followed by Helsinki and Zurich in the second and the third place respectively. Others in the top 10 list include Auckland (4th), Oslo (5th), Copenhagen (6th), Geneva (7th), Taipei City (8th), Amsterdam (9th) and New York at the 10th place.

In SCI's context, 'smart city' describes an urban setting that applies technology to enhance the benefits and diminish the shortcomings of urbanisation.

The second edition of the SCI ranked 109 cities worldwide by capturing perceptions of randomly chosen 120 residents in each city.

Hundreds of citizens from 109 cities were surveyed in April and May 2020 and asked questions on the technological provisions of their city across five key areas: health and safety, mobility, activities, opportunities and governance.

Reflected in this year's rankings is that cities have ever differing approaches to technology as managing the pandemic has become increasingly important in local politics, the report said.

"We cannot ignore the impact of Covid," said IMD's Professor Arturo Bris, who led the work of the ranking as the Director of the World Competitiveness Centre at the Swiss management institute which is behind it. Those with better technology manage the pandemic better. Smart cities are not the solution, but technology helps, he explained.

"Smart cities closer to the top of the rankings seem to deal with unexpected challenges of the devastating pandemic with a better outcome," remarked Professor Heng Chee Chan, Chairperson of the Lee Kuan Yew Centre for Innovative Cities at SUTD.

## Pandemic affects education of special children severely

A lot of kids with disabilities find comfort in routine, but when the routine gets disrupted; their anxiety levels go up and tend to behave differently.

The Coronavirus pandemic disrupted the lives of children across the board, but it caused immense stress for those with disabilities, especially the hearing and speech impaired and children with autism and other sensory processing disorders.

National convener of Special Educator's Forum, Kalpagiri shares how difficult it is for these kids to cope with the pandemic. "We certainly cannot open the schools, but online classes for these kids are not possible since their attention span is less and they get distracted easily. Even in a class, it is a bit difficult to handle these kids. But when they get used to a teacher, it really helps their growth. One important



point here is, these kids may forget what was taught to them due to this long gap due to the pandemic. Most of them will have to be taught from the scratch. No learning certainly has taken a huge affect on these kids."

Swathi Kureti, a special educator, but online classes for these kids are not possible since their attention span is less and they get distracted easily. Even in a class, it is a bit difficult to handle these kids. But when they get used to a teacher, it really helps their growth. One important

board activities for special kids in the family. However, I teach kids who come from lower economic strata. The parents of these kids keep calling me to take classes, however since we have no permission I can't do that. I try to keep in touch via phone, but that doesn't help much. Unfortunately, most of these kids have already started forgetting what was taught to them."

Dr Garima Vegivada, Clinical Director, Speech Language Pathology, however shares, that these students can be taught on call for whatever time suits the kids.

"Lack of daily therapies in such children actually lead to overall backsliding. Since these kids need full-time care and they not going back to their routine at the earliest impacts the family's social and financial fortunes, with several being working parents busy with their daily routines while struggling to make ends meet."

## Activists laud TS for well-rounded midday meal

Alka Singh, a child right advocate, who has done a survey in various states of the country regarding the quality of mid-day meals said, "Students in Telangana are provided one of the best midday meals in country. The government has made sure that all kids have a well-balanced diet

that contains all nutrient and vitamins. That is a commendable job compared to other states. Several anganwadi establishments in the state are in fact working with the local communities, involving them in kitchen gardens. This imparts knowledge to the parents about how to make sure the kids are well fed. They not just contribute towards a child's growth, but spreading awareness among the community as well."

Sharing the importance of eggs being included in a child's diet, which is being neglected in other states, Nutritionist Dr Janaki said, "Just like milk, egg is also a whole meal. It contains all the vitamins, protein and carbohydrates. For kids, who only get one good meal per day, eggs play an important source of nutrients."

## Walmart Foundation grants to empower farmers

partners are focused on supporting farmers to increase their resilience and sustainability for a better future."

The new funding would allow non-profits Tanager and PRADAN to further scale their efforts to help farmers. Both grantees will focus on increasing opportunities for women

farmers via farmer producer organisations (FPOs). "There is huge potential for innovative technology solutions to help farmers in India improve productivity and yield, access valuable market information and succeed as part of a more efficient and transparent supply chain," said Kalyan

Krishnamurthy, Flipkart Group chief executive officer and a member of the Walmart Foundation Board of Directors. In the latest round, non-profit organisation Tanager will receive more than \$2.6 million to extend its successful 'Farmer Market Readiness' (FMP) programme and help

farmers in Andhra Pradesh further expand their knowledge, resources and reach. The phase 2 of the programme will focus on strengthening the sustainability of 13 FPOs, in order to help more than 15,000 farmers, including more than 5,600 women farmers, increase their productivity and profitability. # Hanuman, the embodiment of communication skills

Hanuman, Hanumanth or Anjaneya, a mighty minister of the monkey king Sugriva, appears in the Ramayana for the first time in Kishkindha Kanda—the fourth part of the epic.

He is the leading character Sundara Kanda. Lord Rama and Lakshmana, while searching for Sita abducted by the monster king Ravana, reach the foothills of Rushyamook Mountain where, in the precincts of Kishkindha, king Sugriva lives in exile. Afraid of his elder brother Vali, Sugriva assumes that they have come there to kill him at the instance of Vali. Hanuman realises why Sugriva is worried and pacifies him with his communication skills, saying: "If a king of your stature and calibre loses his reasoning, logic, wisdom, intellect and integrity, then how can he save his people? Do not form opinions merely on face value."

Sugriva deploys Hanuman to elicit information about Rama and Lakshmana.

Hanuman, on meeting Rama, tells the brothers: "My lords! Who you are? Why did you come here? By looks you seem to be kings, sages or gods."

His communication with Rama and Lakshmana is so interesting that they are spell-bound and do not interrupt him. Hanuman tells them about himself and also about Sugriva, his exile and Vali.

Rama is pleased and tells Lakshmana, "Hanuman appears to be an expert and exponent of grammar. There is no aberration in his words. He hasn't uttered a single word out of context. He is a true, devout and committed emissary."

Upon reaching Sugriva, Hanuman introduces the brothers so eloquently that the exiled king gets to know everything and in the right perspective. "He is the personification

of truth, bravery, courage, divinity and what not. Since his wife was abducted by Ravana, in search of her, soliciting your friendship he came here with his brother. You ought to go to him and worship him," he says. Ultimately, a bond of friendship develops between Rama and Sugriva.

After Vali is killed by Rama in a duel between the brothers, Hanuman consoles Vali's wife Tara saying: "Past is past. What you are supposed to do now is not cry but plan for the future. Your son Angad, still a boy,

needs to be taken care of and it's your responsibility."

Later Rama performs the coronation ceremony of Sugriva as the Monkey King of Kishkindha.

When Hanuman feels that Sugriva has forgotten the responsibility of searching for Sita, he reminds him saying: "O King of Monkeys! You acquired prosperity, wealth and a kingdom. Your friend's work is yet to be accomplished. It's better that you immediately initiate efforts to do the work entrusted to you by your friend."

Sugriva jumps into action and sends monkey warriors. Hanuman is sent to the south. Hanuman and his colleagues search every nook and corner for Sita, but in vain.

Meanwhile, Vali's son Angad, dejected at not finding Sita anywhere, decides to stay

back with his supporters away from Kishkindha, the thoughts of revolt against Sugriva apparently in his mind.

Hanuman realises Angad's intentions and cautions him of the consequences in unequivocal terms, in perhaps the most eloquent of words in the Ramayana.

On the advice of Sampathi, Sugriva's monkeys reach the ocean to cross it and reach Lanka. Unable to cross it, the monkeys feel dejected, and here again, Hanuman displays his oratorical skills and enthralls them. On reaching Lanka, Hanuman is stopped from entering the city by Lankhini, the chief sentry who questions his credentials. Unperturbed, Hanuman tells her that he came to see the beautiful city with its army, ramparts, domes and houses. He is finally allowed to enter. Hanuman finds Sita

in the Ashoka garden. He climbs a tree and speaks first about Dasarath and manages to attract Sita's attention. He then mentions Dasharath's elder son Rama, his qualities, his valour, his omniscience, omnipotence, omnivorous characteristics etc. Having heard her husband's name, she is even more interested. Hanuman concludes by saying: "I am fortunate that I could find Sita here."

By now Sita is convinced about Hanuman's sincerity and confirms that she is indeed Sita. It is then Hanuman reveals the purpose of his coming there to Sita. Here again Hanuman uses all his communication skills by praising Rama and his qualities. He says that Rama, with such great qualities, sent him as his emissary to find out where Sita was. To remove all doubts in her mind, Sita asks Hanuman to explain in detail how he

became a friend of Rama and also describe the appearance of both Rama and Lakshmana.

On taking leave from Sita, Hanuman takes a look around the city and then voluntarily surrenders in order to reach Ravana. Before Ravana, Hanuman again displays his oratorical skills. "At the behest of King Sugriva, I am here to see you and your Lanka. I saw Sita in your Lanka. (He does not mention abduction, but says that she is in his custody illegally). You, who literally studied all pious literature, should not indulge in troubling women like this. This will lead to annihilation of your kith and kin and the entire kingdom. None can face Rama in the war. Hand over Sita to Rama," Hanuman tells Ravana. Time and again, Hanuman proves that he was an embodiment of communication skills.

The division bench asked Nagamani to file her reply to the objections to the report submitted by Hyderabad police commissioner Anjani Kumar in the issue in six week's time.

They said that they vacated their houses four years ago and are facing troubles in paying rents", he said.

Tribal girl gang raped, one arrested

**Godda (Jharkhand):** A tribal girl has allegedly been gang-raped in Jharkhand's Godda district, police said on Thursday. One accused has been arrested and a manhunt has been launched to nab the other, district Superintendent of Police Y S Ramesh said. The incident took place near Basdiha village in Lalmatia police station area on Tuesday night, he said. As per the FIR lodged by the survivor, she was going to Lalmatia with her friend on a motorcycle on Tuesday evening when their vehicle got stuck in the mud near Basdiha, the officer said. "Two motorbike-borne passersby beat her friend up, snatched his mobile phone and dragged the girl to a nearby bush, where they took turns to rape her till late night," the SP told PTI. The survivor managed to escape from the spot on the pretext of attending nature's call and informed the police, he said. A team was formed under Mahagama Sub-divisional Police Officer (SDPO) Veerendra Chaudhary and one accused was arrested on Wednesday, the SP said.

ED files charge sheet against Kashmiri separatist

**New Delhi:** The Enforcement Directorate has made Kashmiri separatist leader Shabir Shah's wife Bilquis Shah an accused in a 2005 money laundering case against him and reported hawala dealer Mohammad Aslam Wani for alleged terror financing to cause unrest in J&K. The probe agency named her as an accused in its supplementary charge sheet filed in the case on Wednesday. Additional Sessions Judge Dharmender Rana will take up the matter on November 10. In the charge sheet filed by ED's special public prosecutors N K Matta and Rajeev Awasthi, the probe agency said that Bilquis Shah, along with Shabir Shah had received Rs 2.08 crore from Aslam Wani. It said the claim was based on Wani's disclosure in the case, where he admitted that "all amounts were in cash and were handed over to Shabir Ahmad Shah and on three occasions to Dr. Bilquis Shah".

India ranks 116 in World Bank's human capital index

**Washington:** India has been ranked at the 116th position in the latest edition of the World Bank's annual Human Capital Index that benchmarks key components of human capital across countries. However, India's score increased to 0.49 from 0.44 in 2018, as per the Human Capital Index report released by the World Bank on Wednesday. The 2020 Human Capital Index update includes health and education data for 174 countries - covering 98 per cent of the world's population - up to March 2020, providing a pre-pandemic baseline on the health and education of children, with the biggest strides made in low-income countries. The analysis shows that pre-pandemic, most countries had made steady progress in building human capital of children, with the biggest strides made in low-income countries. Despite this progress, and even before the effects of the pandemic, a child born in a typical country could expect to achieve just 56 per cent of their potential human capital, relative to a benchmark of complete education and full health, the Bank said. Malpass said that the World Bank is trying to work to restart the learning process.

# No force can stop Indian troops from patrolling: Rajnath on border row

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Thursday asserted that no force in the world can stop Indian soldiers from patrolling the country's border in Ladakh region.

Making a statement in Rajya Sabha on the situation in eastern Ladakh, he said China has amassed troops on the border and in response India has made appropriate counter deployment.

China, he said, made "provocative military manoeuvres" on August 29/30 in an attempt to change the status quo in the south bank area of Pangong Lake in the Ladakh region at a time when the two sides were engaged in military and diplomatic talks to de-escalate tensions.

The defence minister said there is a mismatch between what China says and does.

"Unki kathani aur karni alag hai (their actions are at variance with their words)," he said.

The skirmishes and face-off in the last few months with China, that left 20 Indian soldiers dead and inflicted heavy



casualties on the Chinese sides as well, were primarily over the issue of patrolling the Ladakh border. "No force in the world can stop Indian soldiers from patrolling. Our soldiers have sacrificed their lives only for this," the minister said. He was responding to a clarification sought by former defence minister A K Antony on the issue of Indian forces not being allowed to patrol in certain parts of the Galwan valley. "I want to make it clear (that) skirmishes and face-off are because of this (issue of patrolling)," he said, adding the patrolling pattern is traditional and well defined.

Singh made the statement in Rajya Sabha after the government and opposition agreed not to have a discussion on the sensitive issue.

Chairman M Venkaiah Naidu, however, allowed members to seek a few clarifications on the statement, which was almost identical to the one Singh had made in Lok Sabha on September 15. The minister said India and China are yet to resolve their boundary question. "China does not accept the customary and traditional alignment of the boundary between India and China," he said.

"We believe that this align-

ment is based on well-established geographical principles confirmed by treaties and agreements, as well as historical usage and practice, well-known for centuries to both sides," he said.

The Chinese position, however, is that the boundary between the two countries has not been formally delimited, that there exists a traditional customary line formed by the extent of jurisdiction that they claim was exercised historically by each side, and that the two sides have different interpretations of the position of the traditional customary line," he said. China, he said, continues to be in illegal occupation of about 38,000 square kilometers of Ladakh. Besides it also holds 5,180 sq km of Indian territory in Pakistan occupied Kashmir that Pakistan had illegally ceded in 1963. "I would like to mention here that as yet there is no commonly delineated Line of Actual Control (LAC) in the border areas between India and China and there is no common perception of the entire LAC," he said, adding more than two decade

old agreements call for two sides to maintain minimal forces along the LAC.

On the latest situation, the minister said India has noticed a buildup of troops and armaments by China in the border areas adjacent to Eastern Ladakh since April.

"In early May, the Chinese side had taken action to hinder the normal, traditional patrolling pattern of our troops in the Galwan Valley area, which resulted in a face-off," he said. Even as this situation was being addressed by the Ground Commanders, in mid-May the Chinese side made several attempts to transgress the LAC in other parts of the Western Sector. This included Kongka La, Gogra and North Bank of Pangong Lake.

"These attempts were detected early and consequently responded to appropriately by our armed forces," he said.

"We made it clear to the Chinese side both through diplomatic and military channels that China was, by such actions, attempting to unilaterally alter the status quo," he said.

## Less than 3% population in tribal dts Covid +ve

Less than 3 percent population in 177 tribal-dominated districts in the country has been detected as positive for coronavirus, the government told the Rajya Sabha on Thursday.

Union Tribal Affairs Minister Arjun Munda also told the Upper House that so far, there has been "no report of major outbreak of the disease in tribal areas".

Citing a recent study conducted by IIT Delhi, the minister said, "Less than 3 percent of the population in 177 districts with 25 percent tribal population or more has been detected as corona positive".

The minister also said the COVID response team of his ministry has formulated a pandemic response plan to protect the livelihoods and health of Scheduled Tribes.

"The same has been approved by the Secretary, Tribal Affairs, and circulated among various stakeholders for necessary action. States and Union Territories have been asked to utilize funds from



state tribal sub plans and submit a comprehensive proposal on these lines under various schemes of the ministry," he said.

Measures in the response plan include provision of community kitchens in tribal areas, ensuring supply of ration, basic financial support through direct benefit transfer, improving village-level water availability, and support towards creation of isolation and quarantine facilities in areas with ST population.

The Ministry of Tribal Affairs has also done mapping of sectoral gaps down to the level of gram panchayats and villages in collaboration with the Ministry of Rural Development, Munda said.

## 'Getting permanent UNSC membership our priority'

India on Thursday said it has accorded the "highest priority" to getting permanent membership in an expanded UN Security Council that reflects contemporary global realities.

Minister of State for External Affairs V Muraleedharan said India is actively engaged in the ongoing inter-governmental negotiations on reform of the powerful body at the UN and has been working alongside other like-minded countries and groupings.

Muraleedharan was replying to a question on whether the government was making serious efforts to acquire a permanent seat for India at the UN Security Council (UNSC).

"Government has accorded the highest priority to getting permanent membership for India in an expanded UN

Security Council that reflects contemporary global realities," he said.

"India in collaboration with other pro-reform countries has been consistently making efforts to build support among the UN member states for expansion of the UNSC, in both permanent and non-permanent categories," the minister said.

At present, the UNSC comprises five permanent members and 10 non-permanent member countries which are elected for a two-year term by the General Assembly of the United Nations. The five permanent members are Russia, the UK, China, France and the United States and these countries can veto any substantive resolution. There has been growing demand to increase the number of permanent members to reflect the contemporary global reality.

## Govt says it did not incur expenses for 'Howdy-Modi'

The government on Thursday said it did not incur any expenses for the 'Howdy-Modi' event in the US city of Houston in September last year and that it was organised by a not-for-profit group.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi received a thunderous reception when he, accompanied by US President Donald Trump, addressed a crowd of over 50,000 Indian-Americans at the event in a stadium in Houston on September 22, 2019. Specifically asked whether the government incurred any financial expenses for the event or funded its organisers, Muraleedharan said "no".



## Recoveries exceed active cases of Covid by over 30 lakh

India's COVID-19 recoveries have crossed 40 lakh and exceed the active cases of infection by 30,15,103, taking the recovery rate to 78.64 per cent, the Union Health Ministry said on Thursday.

The total number of active cases in the country has crossed 10 lakh as on date. There are 10,09,976 active cases of COVID-19 in the country which comprise 19.73 per cent of the total caseload, the data updated at 8 am showed.

Close to half -- 48.45 per cent -- of the active cases are concentrated in Maharashtra, Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh. "Together with the states of Uttar Pradesh and

Tamil Nadu, these five states contribute nearly 60 per cent of the total active infections," the ministry underlined.

Maharashtra (17,559) contributed more than one-fifth of the new recoveries (21.22 pc) while the states of Andhra Pradesh (10,845), Karnataka (6,580), Uttar Pradesh (6,476) and Tamil Nadu (5,768) contributed 35.87 per cent of the new recoveries. These states together account for 57.1 per cent of total new recoveries, the ministry said adding, "Spurred by high recoveries, the national recovery rate continues to follow its rising curve. It has risen to 78.64 per cent as on date." India has been registering very high recoveries for two consecutive days, the ministry said.

## Anarchy prevailed in country before Modi took charge, says Adityanath

munity needs to come together to defeat the virus. Many pin their hopes on a vaccine - but let's be clear: there is no panacea in a pandemic. A vac-

cine alone cannot solve this crisis; certainly not in the near term," Guterres said at a press conference on Wednesday.

He said nations need to massively expand new and existing tools that can respond to new cases and provide vital treatment to suppress transmission and save lives, especially over the next 12 months.

Guterres voiced concern that the outbreak is out of control

and the world will soon pass "the grimmest of milestones" with one million lives lost to the virus. "The COVID-19 pandemic is a crisis unlike any in our lifetimes, and so this year's General Assembly session will be unlike any other, too," he said.

"In this 75th anniversary year, we face our own 1945 moment. We must meet that moment," he said.

## US company to pay \$3L to resolve H-1B violations

A New Jersey-based staffing company has agreed to pay USD 345,000 to settle allegations that it has violated immigration and employment regulations concerning continuous employment and wage requirements of workers it had brought to the US on H-1B visas.

The H-1B visa is a non-immigrant visa that allows US companies to employ foreign workers in speciality occupations that require theoretical or technical expertise. H-1B visas are most sought-after among Indian IT professionals.

The US Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), the Department of Labour and the US Attorney for the District of New Jersey ordered Savantis Solutions to pay USD 345,000 to resolve allegations against H-1B related violations.

Savantis, formerly known as Vedicsoft Solutions, has a presence in India as well. The company is involved in consulting, technology and staffing, utilising primarily foreign nationals in the US pursuant to H-1B visas.

## Restore status quo ante on LAC with China: Oppn

Opposition leaders in the Rajya Sabha asked the government on Thursday to restore status quo ante as on April this year on the India-China border. Cutting across party lines, members in the Upper House of Parliament expressed their solidarity and support to the armed forces, which are facing a standoff situation against the Chinese army in eastern Ladakh. Leader of Opposition

Ghulam Nabi Azad, Anad Sharma and former defence minister A K Antony of the Congress asked the government to take efforts to restore the status quo ante of April and resolve the over-three-month-old border standoff.

Some members such as Prasanna Acharya of the BJD and Sanjay Raut of the Shiv Sena cautioned the government while entering into any agreement with China over the present situation.

# T cells play bigger role in reducing Covid severity


Vaccine candidates for COVID-19 should elicit a broad immune response that includes antibodies, and the body's helper and killer T cells, according to a study which says weak or uncoordinated immunity may lead to a poor disease outcome.

The research, published in the journal Cell, confirms that a multi-layered, virus-specific immune response is important for controlling the novel coronavirus during the acute phase of the infection and reducing COVID-19 disease severity. "Our observations could also explain why older COVID-19

patients are much more vulnerable to the disease," said study senior author Shane Crotty from the La Jolla Institute for Immunology in the US.

"With increasing age, the reservoir of T cells that can be activated against a specific virus declines and the body's immune response becomes less coordinated, which looks to be one factor making older people drastically more susceptible to severe or fatal COVID-19," Crotty said.

In the research, the scientists collected blood samples from 50 COVID-19 patients, and analysed multiple branches of their immune system -- novel coronavirus specific antibodies,



helper and killer T cells. It was particularly important to us to capture the whole range of disease manifestation from mild to critically ill so we could identify differentiating immunological factors," said study co-author and infectious

disease specialist Sydney Ramirez. The researchers found that all fully recovered individuals had measurable antibody, helper and killer T cell responses against the novel coronavirus SARS-CoV-2. However, they said the

response varied widely in acute COVID-19 patients, with some lacking neutralising antibodies, others helper or killer T cells or any combination thereof.

"When we looked at a combination of all of our data across all 111 measured parameters we found that in general, people who mounted a broader and well-coordinated adaptive response tended to do better," said Carolyn Moderbacher, another co-author of the study from La Jolla Institute for Immunology. "A strong SARS-CoV-2 specific T cell response, in particular, was predictive of milder disease. Individuals whose immune response was less

coordinated tended to have poorer outcomes," Moderbacher said.

The scientists found that the effect was magnified when they broke down the dataset by age.

"People over the age of 65 were much more likely to have poor T cell responses, and a poorly coordinated immune response, and thus have much more severe or fatal COVID-19," Crotty said.

The scientists explained that as people age, the immune system's supply of deployable immature T cells dwindles, with fewer cells available to be activated to respond to a new virus.

## Time to join hands to battle Covid, says BJP

The opposition should join hands with the government to battle the "unprecedented" COVID-19 crisis that has brought the globe to its knees rather than indulging in "petty criticism and blatant sarcasm", BJP leader Rajeev Chandrasekhar said in Rajya Sabha on Thursday.

Participating in a discussion on the COVID-19 pandemic and the steps taken by the Government, he said "Some are now questioning lockdown...this wisdom of hindsight is easy to develop but

early interventions were crucial," and termed the lockdown "unambiguously" necessary.

Almost all countries resorted to lockdown as the pandemic was unprecedented since 1918's Spanish flu, he said and added that under the present situation, lockdowns are necessary tools in the tool kits of governments till vaccines are developed. He said it is a tough choice between "life and livelihood" and credited the government for minimising economic contraction by taking a slew of steps to help revive different sectors.

## Who will regulate TV?

If the SC has to intervene every time on mala fide content on channels, it will be flooded with petitions. We need a neutral code



It is sad that the fourth estate, which ought to be a thriving institution in its own right — showing a mirror to society and advocating rights and issues that politics ignores — now needs regulation or correction by other institutions. Weaponised as a tool of governance and propaganda for long, it took the Supreme Court to stop it from destroying the social fabric instead of mending it. The top court restrained a channel from telecasting a controversial programme that sought to “expose” a “conspiracy and jihad to infiltrate Muslims” into the Indian civil services. The court was right to see through the agenda to vilify a certain community on the pretext

of an investigation and perpetuate a narrative suited to the political climate of the day. It had to halt broadcast that would have aggravated an already prejudiced sentiment in the country and, as it said, challenged the constitutionally mandated plurality of India. But then how many broadcasts will it stop given the partisan nature of the hundreds of news channels in India today, some of them owned and funded by political parties themselves? How will it manage the whataboutery and a slew of counter-petitions of why a certain programme doesn't deserve to be aired while others do? What is divisive and what is not? The court also deliberated on national debates on television channels, which the bench felt required regulation. To bolster its argument, it cited parallel investigations being carried out in criminal investigations, quite clearly implying how motivated interests were manufacturing a national mindset that would go by a heave of emotion rather than facts. Given these observations, the court would then have to become a media watchdog, too, stretching its resources no end. As it is, the Government, a day after the verdict on the channel perceived as friendly to it, filed an affidavit in the Supreme Court, arguing that if the latter desired to undertake the exercise to regulate the media, then it should first do so for digital media, and not electronic media, because social platforms have a faster and wider reach. That is indeed another problem, as given their dependence on open traffic, digital platforms have often been the purveyor of hate speeches and campaigns that have fuelled unrest on the ground. There are more than 50 documented cases of mob violence triggered by misinformation spread over social media in India over the last two years. Many platforms, including Facebook and YouTube, have only to upload an uncensored clip that swiftly becomes credible headlines when picked up by TV media. Facebook and Twitter are too big and have become influencers in their own right, embedding themselves in policies of the regime that is crucial to their business plans in respective countries. Facebook, with over 2.3 billion monthly users across its family of networks, has become too much of a behemoth to be democratic. But its subsidiary messaging board, WhatsApp, is by far the most popular of the platforms. With India accounting for 400 million of its global base of 1.5 billion users, it ends up being the focus of discussions on the spread of misinformation. It has become as much an information propagator as it has a disseminator.

The court mentioned setting up a committee of five citizens who can come up with standards for electronic media but what about existing frameworks, which are toothless at the moment? There is no statutory regulatory mechanism but self-regulatory bodies like the News Broadcasters' Association (NBA), Broadcast Editors' Association and News Broadcasters' Federation have failed to rise to the occasion and ensure a modicum of professionalism. Besides, this multiplicity of authorities generates its own politics and lobbies. The NBA does take up broadcast complaints seriously and has a code of ethics but because it is in the nature of just guidelines and not mandatory, there is no bold, punitive action. Usually, errands are let off with an apology or a minor rap on the knuckles. Besides, members of the NBA are from channels themselves and their hands are somewhat tied up by the prevalent business model of journalism, the kind that links coverage and pitches to revenue and funding. Till we have a singular code that's trustworthy, neutral or effective or till we have a legally empowered regulatory body, there will always be conflict of interest. Of course, the best regulation would be if broadcast media stuck to sensible rather than sensational journalism. Our Constitution has guaranteed the right to freedom but it implies we follow our duties, too. In a democracy, the media is as much accountable to citizens as are other institutions. It cannot be a self-serving clique but has to call out its own and self-cleanse in the interest of holding up its institutional integrity. Or it could content itself with scripting doggerel.

## No country for children

The World Bank's human capital index shows the potential development of kids slid to 50 per cent in pandemic times



As expected, the impact of the Coronavirus pandemic has not just been on health and global economies; its multi-pronged effect is now threatening to erase the gains made in improving child education and health in the years before the outbreak. This fallout of the contagion is the most evident in the poor and Third World nations, the World Bank said while commenting on the Human Capital Index for 2020, which ranks countries on how well children are prepared for the future, with an emphasis on factors like schooling and healthcare. Despite the fact that most countries made steady gains in improving health and education prior to

the pandemic, the virus has dealt a body blow to all these efforts. Children in a low-income country will likely achieve only 56 per cent of their human capital compared to ones with access to a complete education and full healthcare. This is alarming as human capital is absolutely vital to the financial and economic future of any country as well as its social well-being. And as World Bank President David Malpass has warned, “inequalities among children are set to increase” and as “more than one billion children have been out of school due to COVID, they could lose as much as \$10 trillion in lifetime earnings.” In our case, the girl child would be the first victim as her education is the first casualty in poor households forced to choose between feeding the family and reserving knowledge pursuit as a rare privilege. Besides, while the education of children from well-heeled families will not face so much disruption, students from marginalised families and in rural areas will suffer, both due to lack of smartphones, computers, laptops and the lack of infrastructure and knowhow on how to use these enablers. Though both teachers and students have adapted to online classes to a large extent in urban areas, teachers themselves are not satisfied because they feel that the learning experience can never compete with brick and mortar classrooms. In an online setting, students may have more distractions and less supervision, which can reduce their motivation to do well academically. First there is the issue of keeping students engaged. Then how do you teach subjects which require live experiments and demonstrations? What of personal attention to struggling students? Research shows that students who struggle in physical classes are likely to struggle even more online. Also, being in school/college in person with teachers and other students creates social pressures and benefits that can help motivate the young to engage.

On the health front, too, there is cause for concern as the lockdown impacted programmes tackling malnutrition. With schools closed, children from impoverished families have been deprived of their one, daily nutritious food in the form of free mid-day meals. Immunisation programmes have been hit by the lockdown as has the community vigilance by the ASHAs and ANMs, who were the first point of contact for parents with sick children. If the world had to work hard to provide an equitable world for children, it will have to work doubly hard to mend the damage caused by the contagion in the years to come.

# The tale of two IPLs

IPL is one of the rarest sports spectacles which completely subverts otherwise ubiquitous nationalist and parochial discourses

After months of uncertainty and speculation, the Indian Premier League (IPL) is all set to start; outside the country of its origin and minus the shrieking fans. Everyone, even its critics and detractors, admits to its stupendous popularity. For most of its supporters and fans, it is an event almost of national importance, no less than the General Elections. In fact, a year ago, a large majority of Indians were simultaneously subjected to two kinds of spectacles: one in the sports arena and the other in the political playing field. The dates for both overlapped for a period of one month as the grand spectacle of the IPL (March 23-May 12, 2019) coincided with the heat and dust generated by the General Elections. The Code of Conduct was immediately effective after the dates for the elections were announced on March 10, 2019. In between the elections, the din over the IPL rose to a crescendo and climaxed with the final in which the Mumbai Indians defeated Chennai Super Kings at a “neutral” venue in Hyderabad. As the great excitement over IPL subsided, all hell broke loose over the no-holds-barred election campaigns. There is no doubt about the ephemerality and inconsequentiality of the first, nor about the epochal nature of the second. And yet, many cricket fans think otherwise.

With the pandemic and economy playing havoc, and none of the venues in India playing host, the event may have already lost its usual sheen. Also, the forthcoming elections in Bihar are no match for the national polls last year. Yet, now that both the events are round the corner, it is a good time to reflect on how both affect the public psyche. For cricket has always been seen, at least in the former colonies, as a weapon for political dominance or even as an instrument to fight back dominance; any reader of CLR James' *Beyond the Boundary* would know that. Until the advent of IPL, cricket was about national teams and races. As James says, “Cricket...had plunged” him “into politics long before [he] was aware of it. When [he] did turn to politics, [he] did not have too much to learn.” What lessons in politics does the IPL proffer?

The Election Commission lays down the rules of the game in the Model Code of Conduct. The IPL



follows most of the rules laid down by the International Cricket Council (ICC). During the IPL and also the General Elections, many of these rules were flouted, decidedly or allegedly. The IPL cricketers, drawn from across cricket-playing nations, were bought and sold much before the event. Apparently, inconsequent to the followers of the game, the prices, sometimes incommensurate with the reputation of many players, were headlined. Many high profile players and erstwhile heroes were left unsold or sold late. Political parties also tried to highlight names of politicians who crossed over from their rivals' party. There seemed to be a competition of sorts to rope in glamorous cricketers or film stars from Chennai and Mumbai, from Bhojpuri to Tamil stars. Many of them even floated new parties for the cause of democracy, freedom of expression and so on.

In a certain sense, they were engaged in completely different practices; in another sense, they shared certain commonalities, especially in the visual space of the electronic media. The high octane media coverage, with experts in both “fields” crying themselves hoarse regarding the current performances, strategies and forecasts, was common to both the arenas. A few IPL specialists like Gautam Gambhir, who until last year were commenting both on cricket and political matters, jumped into the fray, hoping to prove their political prowess.

But, of course, the man in the street took a keen interest in both, while the satellite channels

made merry with increased TRPs and phenomenal commercial gains. In the background of both, the Balakot airstrikes fed the emotions directly and indirectly: directly in the political arena of elections, and indirectly by the absence of cricketers from Pakistan.

For one thing, the IPL is not about national teams. No one cares which country the players come from. The jerseys are of individual franchises and one looks in vain for the nationality behind the jersey in case the player happens to be one of the lesser-known. No, IPL is not about nations and nationalism. Nor is it about parochialism. The teams are named after cities but even the Indian players are not from these cities. They could well be from the city of the rival team. Sourav Ganguly can be the coach of Delhi Daredevils playing against the Kolkata Knight Riders for whom he had earlier played and whose coach he had eventually become. Shah Rukh Khan (a Delhiite) living in Mumbai is the owner of Kolkata Knight Riders. The same kind of fuzzing of identities is seen even among spectators.

Talking of Shah Rukh Khan brings to mind the two sets of affiliation leading to a triangular bonding. Politics and Bollywood, politics and cricket, and cricket and Bollywood. For decades, Prime Ministers have made it a point to pose with winning cricket teams and cricketing heroes. But these are about winning international tournaments like the World Cup. Seldom does one see politicians in IPL events. Last year, around the time of the General

Elections, many actors posed with major politicians. One of the X-factors in popularising IPL was that popular film stars like Shah Rukh Khan and Preity Zinta owned franchises.

Whereas communal-based politics is the order of the day, cricket and Bollywood, at least superficially seen, symbolise communal amity. Last year, exactly at a time when communal identities were dominating electoral arithmetic, and politicians were busy dividing and stereotyping people with a certain kind of facial hair, Indian cricketers had broken down this identity divide by almost all of them flaunting facial hair.

Such is the privileging of cricket over other sports. The one cricketing spectacle that the spectators in the subcontinent look forward to is the Indo-Pak encounter during which rabid nationalism rises to the fore. IPL, in contrast, is one of the rarest sports spectacles which completely subverts otherwise ubiquitous nationalist and parochial discourses. The one puzzle that social psychologists need to sort out and explain is how the same people can be so deeply involved in two kinds of spectacles, one entrenched in rabid nationalist discourse and another which is aggressively internationalist. This year, some of these questions will be tested against the backdrop of the Assembly elections in Bihar.

## The intelligent future is here

Events of 2020 have hugely accelerated the human civilisation's race towards finding an alternative to its own organic intelligent brain

Now that most of us are becoming video-conferencing experts, innovating on every call with a new virtual background, while also ordering groceries online and keeping an eye on the latest news updates popping up on our phone and computer screen, will it be too early to crystal gaze into a not-so-distant future, say 2021? Yes, it may be too early to call 2020 a "gap year", specially when each new day has its own set of surprises. But there is no harm in peeping a little into next year's trends. First, there is no escaping the fact that technology will tremendously impact the way we live, work, exercise, eat or buy next year, too. If the pandemic has thrown us into an ocean of uncertainties, if we look around carefully, it is an ocean of data. Those that learn to swim through pretty quickly and get a raft or something to latch on to will soon realise the potential of this ocean of opportunities. It has already started happening but a new technology called Artificial Intelligence (AI) will take over most of what is today relegated to a digital world.

To start with, algorithms would be put to use for early detection or even prediction of pandemics, assessment and even solutions for traffic patterns in a city, incremental/severe weather forecasts, health-care, care for the most vulnerable and so on. But soon, like everything else, it will be all-pervasive in every little life decision. I am not sticking my neck out to say it will happen by next year but events of 2020 have hugely accelerated the human civilisation's race towards finding an alternative to its own organic intelligent brains. The world is already flush with examples on how AI will have multiples of applications from that which is already available across the web. In short, we are on the verge of entering a new technological era which is predictive, sophisticated and has an eerie inorganic intelligence almost running into infinity (it is not enough to cut the cord and think that an AI system has switched off; remember there are thousands of machines crunching data points from multiple sources to predict simple buying behaviour). This will definitely have a deep impact on the human race.

Next will come an age of extreme speeds of data access over the air or 5G. The world would have already been piloting cutting-edge 5G or fifth-generation mobile technology across large geographies and would have been near phase-wise national rollouts, had the pandemic not hit. India definitely has lost a year in the 5G race. However, the protocols and network vendor partner solutions may have been made more secure as a result of the delay.

In fact, 5G is likely to see the first level of deployment in urban areas (where the revenues are) and besides helping you download (at say five times the speeds of your current streaming action) social media videos/your favourite films and cricket matches, will also prove to be a great tool for remote and risky jobs. If some of the arterial sewer lines in a city are fitted with 5G chips, there could be a possibility of completely eradicating the need for human intervention in maintenance of a city's drainage system. If the data coming in and also fed into the chips are analysed at the back-end by smart machines (think AI), who, then takes decisions to deploy little machine worms into the sludge to clean a choke or fix a leakage or even defuse a toxic gas emission, it would mean saving a few thousand precious lives each year. Together with this will come the ultra-smart homes (the protocols for which are already in advanced stages of negotiation by big tech companies) where perhaps your cooking burner will decide the menu and your bar may order itself a few of your favourite wines in case you aren't stocked for the weekend. While robotic surgeries performed over the network specially for remote terrains (read rural) are already happening outside India, a self-driving car in Chandni Chowk may be further away.

Now that the all-pervasive technology has started to co-exist with us in our altered carbon realities, the threats to humanity will also increase. These threats would be increasingly cyber and 2021 will likely see more cyber security attacks (small, big, macro) than all of these years of digital revolution put together. The tell-tale volumes of these cyber security attacks (think SIM cloning, phishing attacks, stealing of bank passwords and OTPs) are already giving consumers and lawmakers a nightmare with increased adoption of the digital world during these work from home times. Think of the manifold increase of these forces as the technology world starts getting more complex with evolving protocols and appendages. You are more likely to hear the word cyber security in almost every important public forum and ministerial dialogues than you have ever heard in your life. Along with these, and one can only wish, multilateral solutions to tackling emerging threats will also emerge, which prevent anti-State forces from manipulating users of emerging technology. There will be new policy regimes, language and grammar for embracing these brave new islands we are heading towards, but let's keep those for a later piece.

## Spare a thought for our kids

Let our children, including those at the margins of territory, identity, services, social and economic interventions, find themselves future-ready

Infants and children — naked, hungry, crying, sleeping in overcrowded trucks, on the shoulders of their tired parents and caretakers. These were some of the heart-breaking pictures that emerged as everyday lives were disrupted following the COVID lockdown put in place in March across India. The multiple fault lines of our societal order were more visible than ever as migrant workers and their families were seen out on the roads across major cities, while the rest of us took to working from home. This was not "a long walk to freedom". It was a walk back home through a terrain that was as indifferent as it was strange. It was reverse migration, a story of lost livelihoods and ever-increasing struggles. For some, it was a walk to their deaths.

As we battle the Coronavirus and its varied impacts on our lives, it is important that we do not lose sight of these fault lines. It has especially hit the families of workers in the unorganised sector, who do not have adequate social protection, support and additionally find it hard to provide adequate care to their children.

One of the casualties of the lockdown was the slew of programmes tackling malnutrition. As per the National Family Health Survey-4 (2015-16), 21 per cent children below the age of five in India were undernourished, 91.4 per cent of the children aged six to 23 months did not receive an adequate diet, one in three (38 per cent) of children under five years of age was stunted, one in five (21 per cent) of the children was wasted, 36 per cent were underweight. The lockdown resulted in a more dire situation where the resulting socio-economic impacts, the closing down of anganwadi centres and the resource crunch minimised the likelihood of availability of food to counter malnutrition.

These intersecting impacts of poverty, gender discrimination, caste and class differences, violence, issues of availability and accessibility of services to the young child and lack of professionalisation of childcare workers are brought to the fore in the *State of the Young Child in India* (SOYC) report, that Mobile Creches, an organisation working for early childhood development (ECD), released recently. While the report was finalised before the pandemic hit the world, it nevertheless offers important insights into the status of India's children under six years of age — who form over 13 per cent of the country's population — in addition to a critical examination of legislative frameworks designed to address their needs. The report also goes beyond a homogenising understanding of the child, as it emphasises various disadvantaged categories within this age group and the dire situation they are in. It calls for specific interventions for each vulnerable category, otherwise it results in a risk of lifelong consequences of deprivation.

The results emerging from the indexing can be used to draw out good practices from top performers like Kerala and Goa and turning more attention towards the poor-performing regions and States like Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Madhya Pradesh. With recommendations stemming from exhaustive analysis, it can also enable in envisioning a post-pandemic world where the issues of marginalisation and neglect receive due attention and policy intervention.

The Integrated Child Development Services

scheme (ICDS), the world's largest programme catering to children, requires recalibration for it suffers from design and capacity deficits, does not adequately address the components of care and early education and is still a long way from reaching the most marginalised in an effective and equitable manner.

The youngest child is often the most invisible and exceptionally vulnerable. This calls for tapping development opportunities in this young age that can set a healthy foundation for life. Investment in ECD not only has the potential to enhance individual capacity and economic growth, it also provides an opening for women empowerment by recognising the overlapping rights of women and children and bringing in State interventions and increased budgetary allocations.

The SOYC report recognises the biological role in care-giving yet questions the gendered stereotypes that result in an undue burden on the mother. In the unorganised sector especially, women are bogged down by a triple burden — the responsibility of childcare, work outside the home that mostly entails unequal access to the market, longer working hours, unhealthy working environment and lesser wages, and the household work as well. Often, young children are seen lying or roaming around these unsafe work sites since these women are deprived of maternity or childcare benefits. This weak support system compromises their ability to provide quality care to the infant/child. Therefore, it is important that where families are unable to pro-

vide due childcare, compounded by their multiple issues, the State steps in as an enabler. As the sole scheme to cater to the needs of children of women engaged in the informal sector, the Government-sponsored National Crèche Scheme has actually seen a reduction in the number of creches, with only 7,930 of them functional across the country in 2019, which translates into one creche per 21,000 children. The scheme needs to be re-imagined and strengthened with serious revision of the budget, and this can also be supplemented by a phased conversion of anganwadis into anganwadicum-creches.

The pandemic-induced lockdown witnessed a rare visibility of anganwadi and ASHA (Accredited Social Health Activist) workers as they emerged to be the first line of defence in dealing with the contagion. However, as the SOYC report notes, they are otherwise marginalised — not seen as a professional cadre, treated as part-time workers, paid well below the minimum wages in most States. There is a pressing need for their critical role in the childcare ecosystem to be recognised, acknowledged, professionalised and for their remuneration to be in line with their responsibilities. The professionalisation of this service will also mean adequate training of these workers and can strengthen the Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) component, which remains a weak focus of the ICDS.

All children in the ages of three to six should have a right to quality ECCE, irrespective of whether they are located at anganwadi centres, pre-pri-

mary sections of Government, private schools or any other pre-school centres.

For the country, prioritising ECD can translate into fulfilment of Sustainable Development Goals and its international commitment towards child rights. While data paucity on multiple dimensions of child well-being hampered the indexing process and a more accurate insight in certain areas, the budgetary analysis through national-level data and allocations to States brings forth issues of inadequate allocation, under-utilisation, lack of management capacity to cater to the needs of children.

The per child expenditure in the country for 2018-19 was an abysmally low figure of ₹1,723. This must be enhanced to ₹1.25 trillion annually to cover funding gaps and ensure holistic interventions. This approach has the potential to bring in returns that would exceed budgetary spends on any alternative welfare programme.

Coronavirus has significantly altered the way we thought of our lives, our work and our very support systems. It has taught us lessons, tragic ones at that.

Yet, it is in this moment that we must recognise the deprivations, neglect and exclusion that mar equitable access of various vulnerable groups, including children, to essential services. Let our children, including those at the margins of territory, identity, services, social and economic interventions, find themselves capable for the future.

## We are being sucked into an ash pond

Fly ash is inevitable while producing thermal power. However, leaving it to pollute the environment is not desirable

Fly ash, a by-product of coal-fired electricity-generating power plants, has always been a predominant challenge for the environment, as its unsafe disposal or ineffective recycling can pose a direct threat to the quality of the air we breathe. Such is our dependence on thermal power plants for energy that apart from the air pollution caused by these behemoths, the fly ash is also compromising other aspects of our environment.

For instance, the breach of the fly ash dyke at the Vindhya NTPC Super Thermal Power Station in Singrauli district of Madhya Pradesh in October 2019 led to the seeping of nearly 35 lakh metric tonnes of fly ash into the Govind Vallabh Pant Sagar, popularly known as the Rihand water reservoir. The Essar power plant at Mahan

in the same district, too, saw breaches in its fly ash dykes leading to its seepage into the environment.

The huge level of water pollution triggered by the seepage of fly ash into the Rihand reservoir raised a red flag and the National Green Tribunal (NGT) imposed an interim penalty of ₹10 crore on the NTPC and Essar after reviewing the ground report filed by its committee. Additionally, the NGT also rapped the Lanco-Anpara power plant to stem the excess ash pond flow into the reservoir. The fly ash caused soil pollution, too, due to which agricultural land became infertile and standing crops suffered.

Thanks to the fly ash pollution, the levels of mercury in the soil, air and water spiked besides causing health complications for local communities as the Rihand reservoir is a source of drinking water for many. All these adverse developments took place despite the existence of statutory notifications from the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MoEFCC) under the Environment Protection Act (EPA) that mandates a 100 per cent utilisation of fly ash.



However, the full extent of the damage caused by the fly ash pond breach has come to light now thanks to a new report submitted recently by the joint committee comprising the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) and the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Roorkee. The report estimated that the fly ash breach by Essar Power Limited caused damages worth ₹7.35 crore while the damage inflicted by the fly ash dyke breach at the NTPC plant was pegged at a whopping ₹104 crore. The committee based its damage estimations on two parameters: One was the Green House

Gas (GHG) emissions caused by the clean-up operations and two the extent of water pollution due to ash overflow.

The use of diesel during the clean-up operations caused the carbon footprint to spike, leading to the damage estimation spike as well. Similarly, the fly ash infusion into the water bodies led to heavy metals and suspended solids leaching into the water. This, too, was translated into cost and added to the damages.

Thermal power stations are still the mainstay of our power sector with renewable sources of energy being nowhere near the required potential to take over as primary sources of our needs. Moreover, the opening up of the coal sector for mining to private players, besides nixing of the mandatory coal-washing requirements, is set to increase the production of fly ash in the future.

Already the ash ponds are overflowing across the nation due to increasing output and decreasing utilisation. As a result, the dykes are frequently breaking, leading to the ash polluting the nearby fields and water bodies.

The last 10 years saw the ash ponds

contain a humongous 627 million tonnes of unused material. This is three times the fly ash being generated per year today, which is 200 million tonnes per annum. The close of 2019 saw an unused fly ash stock quantity of 1,647 million tonnes in India, which is eight times the annual generation quantity.

This is despite the fact that India has the regulations in place that mandate 100 per cent usage of fly ash and there is technology available to put this into action. Yet we are still far from a "full utilisation status."

The Government-driven initiative to promote the use of fly ash in the construction material industry has not been a spectacular success as red bricks continue to be sold and used in open violation of the Government's rules that ban them. Bricks are made out of top soil which is a precious part of our environment. An inch of top soil takes 500,000 years to form as it essentially involves the breaking down and erosion of rock.

If the Government cannot shut the countless red brick kilns that can be seen dotting the countryside, it cannot promote the use of fly ash in the building material industry. The buyer will

have no option but to continue with the traditional red brick, which is easily available. Once the red brick production and supply chain is broken, it will not only save the top soil but also stem the pollution caused by these kilns as they use diesel and sugarcane waste as fuel.

Fly ash can be successfully used to produce bricks in combination with gypsum or lime. The resultant brick is not only eco-friendly but lighter and stronger. Technologies are available today that use compressed natural gas (CNG), an eco-friendly fuel, to fire autoclaves or huge ovens to manufacture fly ash bricks. Each autoclave can manufacture 22,000 fly ash-lime bricks in an eight-hour span.

So, if the thermal power plants in the country were mandated with a target to produce a certain quantity of bricks using the autoclave technology, then the problem of excess fly ash would disappear. There are ways to ensure full utilisation of fly ash; only a strong political will is required to implement the rules that have been put in place for this.

**BSNL's 44 pc mobile network equipment from ZTE**

**New Delhi:** More than 44 per cent mobile network equipment of state-run BSNL is sourced from Chinese firm ZTE and 9 per cent from Huawei, Parliament was informed on Thursday. While replying to a question on the market share of Chinese companies ZTE and Huawei in India, Minister of State for Communications Sanjay Dhotre said that the government maintains no data of Chinese telecom gear makers. Based on information collected from telecom operators, Dhotre said that Reliance Jio Infocomm has not deployed any telecom equipment from ZTE and Huawei for providing services. "Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL) has 44.4 per cent of its mobile network equipment from M/s ZTE and 9 per cent from M/s Huawei. Mahanagar Telephone Nigam Limited (MTNL) has 10 per cent of its mobile network equipment from Chinese equipment manufacturers," Dhotre said in a written reply to the Rajya Sabha. The minister also clarified that the DoT has not issued any order regarding providing source code for security testing.



**Coal India arm CCL plans to instal 80 MWp in FY21**

**New Delhi:** State-owned Coal India Ltd's arm Central Coalfields is planning to instal 80 Megawatt peak (MWp) ground-mounted solar power plant in the ongoing fiscal year. Central Coalfields Ltd (CCL) said that action has also been taken for installation of solar plants on rooftops as green energy will reduce day-time demand. Apart from rooftop solar projects, CCL is in process of awarding work for 20 MWp solar power plant at Piparwar, which is expected to be installed in the current FY 2020-21, the company said in its recent report. In addition, CCL is also planning to instal 80 MWp ground-mounted solar power plant at different command areas of CCL during FY 2020-21, it said. BHEL has successfully commissioned 400 kilowatts peak (kWp) solar power plant at Darbhanga house, the headquarter of CCL. "Rooftop grid connected solar power plants of total capacity 220 KWp, 125 KWp and 50 KWp...have been installed and commissioned," it said. In addition, CCL has generated more than 7.2 lakh units of solar power with the installed solar power plants.

**Indian govt networks badly in 'mega hacking scheme'**

The US Justice Department has charged five Chinese citizens with hacking over a 100 companies and institutions in America and abroad, including the Indian government's networks, and stealing valuable software data and business intelligence.

Deputy US Attorney General Jeffrey Rosen on Wednesday announced three indictments have been unsealed in the matter that collectively charge five Chinese nationals with computer hacking and charge two Malaysian nationals for helping some of those hackers target victims and sell the fruits of their crime.

The Malaysian nationals were arrested on Sunday and the Chinese nationals have been declared fugitive, according to a Justice Department statement.

Rosen severely criticised the Chinese government.

"The Department of Justice has used every tool available to disrupt the illegal computer



intrusions and cyberattacks by these Chinese citizens. Regrettably, the Chinese Communist Party has chosen a different path - of making China safe for cyber-criminals so long as they attack computers outside China and steal intellectual property helpful to China," the deputy attorney general said. "In about 2019, the conspirators compromised Government of India websites, as well as virtual private networks and database servers supporting the Government of India. The conspirators used

VPS PROVIDER servers to connect to an Open VPN network owned by the Government of India," the indictment said.

In the attacks, the conspirators installed 'Cobalt Strike' malware on Indian government-protected computers, it added.

According to the charges, the computer intrusions affected over 100 companies in the United States and abroad. The victims ranged from software development, computer hardware, telecommunication,

social media and video game companies. Non-profit organisations, universities, think-tanks, foreign governments, pro-democracy politicians and activists in Hong Kong were also targeted.

Security researchers have tracked the intrusions using labels "APT41," "Barium," "Winnti," "Wicked Panda," and "Wicked Spider." These intrusions facilitated the theft of source code, software code signing certificates, customer account data, and valuable business information, the researchers said.

These intrusions also facilitated the defendants' other criminal schemes, including ransomware and "crypto-jacking" schemes, the latter refers to the group's unauthorised use of victim computers to mine cryptocurrency. The Chinese hackers also targeted government computers and networks of Vietnam and United Kingdom. The hackers, however were not successful in compromising the government computer networks in the United Kingdom.

**Sensex tanks 323 pts on weak global cues; Nifty below 11,550**

The BSE Sensex tumbled 323 points on Thursday, weighed by losses in index heavyweights Reliance Industries and HDFC twins amid negative cues from global markets after the US Fed highlighted the uncertainty surrounding economic recovery.

The 30-share BSE index ended 323 points or 0.82 per cent lower at 38,979.85. The NSE Nifty fell 88.45 points or 0.76 per cent to 11,516.10

Bajaj Finserv was the top laggard in the Sensex pack, shedding over 2 per cent, followed by PowerGrid, L&T, ICICI Bank, Bajaj Finance, TCS and Sun Pharma.

On the other hand, HCL



Tech, Infosys and Maruti finished higher. According to traders, domestic equities traded on a negative note tracking weak cues from global markets after the US Federal Reserve hinted at key policy interest rate staying close to zero at least through 2023 without unveiling any additional stimulus plans.

Bourses in Shanghai, Hong Kong, Seoul and Tokyo ended with significant losses. Stock exchanges in Europe too opened on a negative note. Meanwhile, global oil benchmark Brent crude was trading 0.26 per cent lower at USD 42.11 per barrel.

**Sebi to rope in agency to maintain investor complaints**

Capital markets watchdog Sebi plans to rope in an agency to process and maintain records of investor complaints received by the regulator. The mandate for the agency is to receive grievances from investors through physical or electronic mode and categorise them.

The agency will also be responsible for tracking complaints' status online and conducting follow-ups, besides preparing action taken reports (ATRs) and updating the status of grievances on Sebi's online platform for complaints, SCORES. Complaints Redress System (SCORES), which registers and tracks investor complaints against listed entities or intermediaries, is a web-based and centralised grievance system developed by the markets watchdog.

The regulator, in a notice, invited applications "in prescribed format for pre-qualification of agencies for processing and maintenance of records of investor complaints



received at Sebi".

The scope of the work also includes despatching complaints to intermediaries or companies and mailing acknowledgment letters to investors. Besides, the selected agency will be responsible for proper storage facility of the complaints received and ATRs for two years and any other work related to investor awareness and education as well as investor grievance redressal.

Spelling out the eligibility criteria, Sebi said the agency should have an expertise in the field of handling registrar and

transfer activities or depository services or have an experience of handling investor matters.

The agency should have provided similar services to public sector undertakings, public sector banks, financial institutions and listed companies, among others.

The annual average turnover of the contractor should be at least Rs 55 lakh during the previous three years and should not have incurred any loss in two consecutive years during the past five years ended March 2020.

**Hindalco signs pact with Hindustan Copper**

Hindalco Industries on Thursday said that it has entered into a pact with Hindustan Copper Ltd (HCL) for the long-term purchase and sale of copper concentrate produced by the PSU.

The memorandum of understanding (MoU) was signed by Hindustan Copper Ltd Chairman and Managing Director Arun Kumar Shukla and Hindalco Industries Managing Director Satish Pai. This is a unique public-private partnership (PPP) that aligns with the government's clarion call for Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan. This partnership is a major step towards import substitution and reducing the nation's dependence on imported copper concentrate, Hindalco Industries said in a statement. Hindustan Copper Ltd (HCL) is the only producer of copper concentrate in India.

**Irdai likely to extend relief for insurers**

Regulator Irdai is mulling over a plan to allow the tenure extension of COVID-19 specific insurance products as the vaccine for the disease is seemingly away by some more time, its chairman Subhash C Khuntia said on Thursday.

Besides, the insurance sector watchdog is also working towards facilitating a standard product for coronavirus, which will be easy to understand by policyholders and will not require "voluminous policy documents".

"With regard to extending the tenure of the COVID-19 related products, we are hoping that the vaccine would not be delayed for too long. But now that it appears that it will



take some more time, we will take decision about extending the tenure of the policy at an appropriate time," Khuntia said while addressing the CII Insurance and Pensions Summit webcast.

Corona Kavach, which was launched on July 10 and is being offered by both general and health insurers, is a stan-

dard health insurance policy created to meet the treatment requirements for coronavirus infection.

The term of the policy ranges from three-and-a-half months to nine-and-a-half months, with maximum insured amount at Rs 5 lakh.

On new COVID-19 insurance products, Khuntia said, "We are coming out with a standard product, the idea is that a standard product, which is to be sold by all the companies, should be so that it becomes much easier for the policyholder to pick up that product. And they don't have to go through voluminous policy documents..." he said.

He also explained how the domestic insurance industry is faring amidst the global eco-

nomical slowdown and hoped that the sector will recover soon as the nature of the service is counter-cyclical, meaning it is needed the most at the time of crisis and distress.

Overall, the insurance business had a de-growth of 19.1 per cent in April as compared to the last year. Now there has been a positive growth of 2.1 per cent during April-August this fiscal as against the previous year's same period, said the Irdai chief.

"Life insurance has grown by 2 per cent and non-life by 3.6 per cent (till August 2020). So it is a positive sign and I am quite hopeful that this growth rate will pick up now. I think the next quarter will be much better than this quarter.

The British government struggled Thursday to overcome American opposition to its plans to breach the Brexit withdrawal agreement with the European Union, after Democratic presidential candidate Joe Biden became the latest U.S. politician to express alarm.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson's move to break parts of the EU divorce deal relating to Northern Ireland has triggered fears it could undermine the 1998 Good Friday peace accord that ended decades of violence between Irish nationalists and British unionists. "We can't allow the Good Friday Agreement that brought peace to Northern Ireland to become a casualty of Brexit," Biden tweeted.

"Any trade deal between the U.S. and U.K. must be contin-

gent upon respect for the Agreement and preventing the return of a hard border. Period," he wrote.

Britain and the EU jointly promised in the Brexit agreement to ensure there are no customs posts or other obstacles on the Northern Ireland border. The open border is key to the stability that underpins the peace settlement. British Foreign Secretary Dominic Raab is in Washington this week, and has been trying to assuage American concerns that a pending government bill would undermine Northern Ireland peace, if passed by lawmakers. He is meeting U.S. politicians including House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, who has warned that Britain won't secure a much sought-after trade deal with the United States, if it undermines the peace accord.

Raab insisted the U.K. has an "absolute" commitment to the Good Friday Agreement. He described Britain's planned law as "precautionary" and "proportionate." Johnson argues the law is intended to be an insurance policy against unreasonable behavior by the European Union that could threaten the unity of the U.K. by disrupting trade between Northern Ireland and the rest of the U.K. The bloc has demanded the U.K. drop the plan by the end of September or face legal action. The bill, which began its journey through Parliament this week, has also caused an uproar in Britain. Five former British prime ministers have criticised Johnson's willingness to break international law, and the government's top legal civil servant and most senior law officer for Scotland have both resigned.

**Investment in P-notes continues to soar; hits 10-month high in Aug**

Investment through participatory notes (P-notes) in the domestic capital market surged to over Rs 74,000 crore till August-end, while the same was at Rs 63,228 crore at the end of July.

The figure at August-end was the highest level of investment since October 2019, when the total value of P-note investments in the Indian markets stood at Rs 76,773 crore.

"The rise in FPI participation through P-notes shows their rise in confidence, since the 15-year lows of P-notes participation in March 2020," said Divam Sharma, Co-founder at Green Portfolio, a Sebi registered portfolio management services.

The forward looking FPIs are selectively taking a fresh long position in the markets on hopes of an early revival of the economy from a complete lockdown phase of first quarter, he noted.

"This also brings a positive outlook to FPI participation in Indian markets since the descent of the P-notes participation post 2017, when Sebi prohibited FIIs to issue ODI (offshore derivative instrument) having derivative instruments as underlying security other than for hedging their position in equity," he added.

Prior to that, investment level was at Rs 62,138 crore, Rs 60,027 crore and Rs 57,100 crore at the end of June, May and April, respectively.

**Amazon's all-women delivery station in Guj**

E-commerce major Amazon India on Thursday said it has set up an all-women delivery station in Kadi, Gujarat - its second such facility in the country.

The new all-women delivery station, operated by a delivery service partner, is part of the company's efforts towards increasing participation of women in the workforce, a statement said.

Kadi is located close to 50 kilometers from Gujarat's capital Ahmedabad, with a population of close to 80,000 people. In 2016, the company had launched its first all-women delivery station in India, with its partner in Chennai, Tamil Nadu, it added.

The Delivery Service Partner program is a last-mile delivery



model of Amazon India, where the company works with partners to leverage their local knowledge of the community. The technological support is offered by Amazon India to facilitate deliveries.

"This first-of-its-kind station in Gujarat is completely managed and run by women across managerial and delivery associate roles. Amazon India

has introduced several measures to ensure a safe workplace for women by creating awareness and building various feedback mechanisms to address concerns through open dialogues," the statement said.

As of now, eight women have been hired for the facility. A helpline number has also been created for associates - who will deliver packages within a 2-5 km radius of the station - to dial in for any support or help needed during the day.

"Our vision is to enable women to discover meaningful career opportunities across the operations network at Amazon India. We have created more than 6,000 opportunities for women across our network where they continue to thrive and excel," Prakash Rochlani, Director, Last Mile Operations at Amazon India, said. Amazon India said it has created opportunities for more than 200 women across its fulfilment network in the state. Recently, the company opened a delivery station, operated by a delivery service partner, in the state which is completely run and managed by transgender individuals.



## Shilpa Shetty addresses cheating allegations against her, Raj Kundra; says 'Truth will be out soon'



**A**ctor Shilpa Shetty has addressed the cheating allegations levelled against her and husband Raj Kundra for allegedly duping an investor in a gold purchase scheme. Shilpa said that the 'truth will be out soon'.

Sachin Joshi, a non-resident Indian (NRI), approached the Khar police in March with a complaint that he had been cheated by Satyug Gold Pvt Ltd, a gold trading company formerly headed by Shetty and Kundra, an official said in a *PTI* report.

According to the complainant, he had purchased nearly a kilo of gold for Rs 18.58 lakh from the company in a gold scheme in March 2014, he said.

Under a five-year plan, the buyer was offered a gold card at a discounted rate and promised a

certain quantity of gold redeemable at the end of the term, he said. Joshi's term plan ended on March 25, 2019, and when he tried to redeem the card, he found that the company's office at Bandra Kurla Complex had shut down.

Shilpa has now told *IANS* the allegations are false. "All these allegations made by Sachin Joshi are completely false and baseless. At Satyug Gold, each and every client's orders have been fulfilled in time. We have even deposited 1kg gold for which Sachin Joshi is yet to pay the demurrage charges legally applicable. Not many know, we also have a cheque bouncing case in court against this serial defaulter. If we didn't wish to give him the gold, we would not have deposited it in court. The court has now appointed an arbitrator where we have presented the charges that are due and clearly mentioned on the invoice and website. The truth will be out real soon," she said.

Earlier in March, Raj had also commented on the same. "It is to state that the claims made by the so-called NRI or Gutka Baron's son (as the media terms him) namely Mr Sachin Joshi is totally false and frivolous. I would like to clarify the news doing the rounds and blatantly picked up by other news agencies without verifying the facts with other parties involved. This act of Mr Sachin Joshi is yet another attempt to malign and tarnish my image and reputation in the country. He has made several attempts before so this is nothing new," he wrote in a statement.

## Kanye urinates on his Grammy award, seeks support from other musicians

on social media. And, while some thought that the video, as pointed out by Grammy winner Dianne Warren, was "vile and disrespectful", some called it a historic moment. Earlier this year, in July, in another Twitter rant, West had said that he was "trying to divorce" his wife, Kim Kardashian West. Kim, later posted a long message on Instagram, saying that Kanye was bipolar, which was also revealed by

Kanye himself in 2018, requesting everybody to be kind and empathetic towards her "brilliant but complicated" husband. The same month, a few days before he accused Kim of cheating on him and him doing the same, he also had announced that he would be running for the Presidency, in the upcoming presidential elections in the US, which are scheduled to take place in November.



# MAXWELL CAREY OZ TO SERIES WIN

Glenn Maxwell and Alex Carey struck centuries in a 212-run stand to help Australia reach a record target of 303 at Old Trafford with two balls remaining and secure a ODI series win over England. Mitchell Starc started the third and deciding game on Wednesday by taking wickets from the first two balls of the match, and ended it by sweeping a four for the winning runs under lights as the Australians consigned England to its first loss in a bilateral ODI series at home since 2015. It was a record ODI chase at the Manchester venue — bettering England's 286-4 against New Zealand in 1986 in a 60-over match — and gave Australia a famous series win over the world champions to take back Down Under from their white-ball tour that also included a 2-1 loss in a T20 series. Replaying to 302-7, Australia slumped to 73-5 only for Carey

and Maxwell to produce Australia's highest sixth-wicket partnership in ODIs and turn the tide. While Carey was the steadier of the pair with his 106 off 114 balls, Maxwell delivered some trademark big hits — he had seven sixes, all over the short boundary on one side of the ground — for his 90-ball 108. "Maxy is in the team to do a specific role, and that's to be able to take the game away from opposition but also be that guy to counterattack and swing momentum in changing rooms," Australia captain Aaron Finch said. "What makes him so damaging is he can play all around the ground. I don't think there're many bowlers in the world that can trouble him when he is having one of those days. The way he navigated that innings and took it deeper and deeper... He did that perfectly." Maxwell eventually fell with 15 balls left and Australia needed 14 off the last two overs. Carey couldn't see the tourists

home, either, departing for 106 to a fabulous diving catch by Mark Wood off the seventh-to-last ball. "It probably wasn't the ideal situation when I came in but being the last batter, I suppose I had a bit of license to go for it right from the start," Maxwell told Sky Sports. "We thought if we could take it as deep as we could, myself and Alex, we might be a chance at the back end." Starc entered, with Australia needing 10 off the last over bowled by legspinner Adil Rashid, and smashed his first

ball down the ground for six. After two singles, Starc swept Rashid round the corner and the ball sped to the boundary rope, sealing a three-wicket win and sparking cheers from his teammates on the balcony. England captain Eoin Morgan said Australia were "too good for us", adding: "To lose two wickets for no runs and then post over 300 is a huge positive for us. I think Jonny Bairstow was outstanding today. Carey and Maxwell played outstandingly well." Playing without Steve Smith for the third straight game this series after the star batsman failed to recover from a knock to the head, the Aussies looked in big trouble after Marnus Labuschagne's sloppy run-out left them five down, with just bowlers to follow Maxwell. England will regret a no-ball by Archer — his first in ODI cricket — off which he had Carey caught at third man when on 9. Wicketkeeper Jos Buttler also dropped a tough chance off a nick by Maxwell when 44. "Small opportunities that we might have taken advantage of might have changed the game," Morgan said, "but when you've been beaten by a better side, you have to put your hand up." It was England's only series loss of its international summer — during which all of its games have been played in a bio-secure bubble without fans — after taking on the West Indies, Ireland, Pakistan and Australia in various formats. **Brief scores:** England 302/7 (Jonny Bairstow 112, Sam Billings 57; Adam Zampa 3/51) lose to Australia 305/7

## 36-hour quarantine for Eng, Aus players

**New Delhi:** The Indian Premier League franchises will be heaving a sigh of relief as all the 21 Australian and English players arriving to the UAE from the United Kingdom will have to undergo just 36 hours of quarantine instead of the earlier prescribed six days. All the franchises which have English and Australian players arriving after the white ball series in the UK had appealed for reducing the quarantine period and the BCCI under Sourav Ganguly's leadership has been able to successfully sort the issue out with local authorities in the UAE. "Yes, I can confirm that all the English and Australian players have to now undergo 36-hour quarantine instead of six days. The matter has been sorted and most of the teams will now have their big stars available from the first game itself," a senior IPL functionary privy to development told PTI. The likes of Steve Smith, David Warner, Jofra Archer, Jos Buttler will arrive in the UAE late on Thursday night (UAE time) and on arrival will undergo RT-PCR test for Covid-19. "The BCCI did a great job in reducing the quarantine period to 36 hours. This means teams like Chennai Super Kings (Josh Hazlewood and Tom Curran), Rajasthan Royals (Smith, Buttler, Archer) will have all their players available from their first game. Ditto for Kings XI Punjab that has Glenn Maxwell in its roster and Delhi Capitals that has Alex Carry," a franchise official said. # MI will miss Malinga's experience: Rohit

Mumbai Indians captain Rohit Sharma on Thursday conceded that "incomparable" Sri Lankan pace legend Lasith Malinga, who has opted out of this year's IPL, will be severely missed by his defending champion team given his "unbelievable" past performances. The 37-year-old Malinga, who is IPL's highest wicket-taker with 170 scalps to his credit, has pulled out citing personal reasons in a major blow to the four-time champions. "I don't think it is easy to come and fill his boots. He has been a match-winner for Mumbai. I have said it many times, whenever we sort of find ourselves in trouble, Malinga was the one to bail us out from that," Rohit said in a pre-season online press conference. "His experience will be missed, what he did with MI is unbelievable and it is unfortunate that he is not a part of the team this year. "We have got likes — (James) Pattinson, Dhawal Kulkarni, Mohsin (Khan) and these are the names that we are looking to replace Malinga with. But obviously what Malinga did for Mumbai, it is not just comparable," he added. Talking about his own role, Rohit said he will continue to open. "I opened the entire tournament last year and I will continue to do that. Again I keep all the options open, whatever the team wants, happy to do that. "Even when I play for India, message from my side to the management has always been the same 'do not close any doors' keep all the options open and I will do the same here as well," he said. India's white-ball vice-captain also felt that correct reading of conditions would be crucial to his team's fortunes. "The challenge for us will be



to adapt to these conditions here which probably none of us are used to, because not a lot of cricketers from our group have

played here," Rohit said. "I think mentally it is about going out there and understanding what the pitch is doing, and based on that, you need to plan your game — whether it is your batting or bowling. So we have had a good chat around the group about that," he elaborated. Talking about the opening match against the Chennai Super Kings, he said Mumbai is ready for the challenge. "CSK are probably one of the successful IPL teams and you can't take them for granted... They will come out all guns blazing. None of us have played cricket for months now, so obviously everybody wants to start on a high. "So, we will be expecting a great contest between the two and we need to focus on what we need to do as team and all our bases are covered," Rohit signed off.

## Need to be mindful of Hardik's workload: Jayawardene

**Abu Dhabi:** Monitoring comeback man Hardik Pandya's workload is paramount for Mumbai Indians coach Mahela Jayawardene as he intends to groom a "few more finishers" for the upcoming edition of IPL. Hardik will play his first game in a year on Saturday having undergone back surgery for stress fracture last year. "Hardik is coming back from an injury. So we will have to be mindful of that but he is looking very good in the nets. Both the players (Pandya brothers) have been fantastic for MI over the last three or four years. It brings a lot of energy to the group," Jayawardene said during MI's virtual media conference. The Sri Lankan legend was asked whether Hardik will again be assigned the finisher's job. "We have used him (Hardik) in different roles in the past and we will look into that. It's good that spinners will get an advantage here so that I also will get some grip. I've improved as a player and a bowler. Hope I get more overs and help the team." The left-hander said he does not have a fixed batting slot and is ready to serve the team at any position. "I will bat as per team demand. I don't have a fixed batting slot. I'm available to serve the team at any spot." Having served long injury lay-offs respectively, the 2018 U-19 World Cup winning duo of Kamlesh Nagarkoti and Shivam Mavi are back in full throttle, Rana said. "Nagarkoti was unfortunate to be injured for two years. He's back strong. But this time, both of them are back in full rhythm and clocking 140kph-plus consistently. It will be challenging for any batsman. I hope they will do well," he added.

# Virat not fazed by empty stands at IPL

Royal Challengers Bangalore skipper Virat Kohli on Thursday said his teammates have become "acceptive" of living in the IPL bio-bubble and there is no "desperation" for a change of environment as they approach the tournament proper from September 19. "When we spoke of the bio-bubble for the first time, we discussed about appreciating the things we have and the situation. All of us have become very relaxed in that environment. It will be the first time that IPL matches will be held in the absence of a packed crowd but Kohli said it is the need of the hour. "All of us have thought about it (initially) and it would be a strange feeling and I won't deny that. But the feeling has changed little bit after the training sessions and practices games," he said.

"At the end of the day you just need to understand why you started playing the game, you started playing for the love of it. Crowds are main part of the game but that is not what you play for. "I can only say one thing that our intensity levels will not drop, I can assure you. There is a larger reason why all this is happening." Kohli was joined by teammates Parthiv Patel and the young Devdutt Paddikal in the interaction. "It has sunk in (staying in bio-bubble). We did not put saliva on the ball during practice games and are taking care of ourself. It is very important to be safe," said Patel.

RCB to honour Covid heroes by wearing tribute jersey  
**New Delhi:** Royal Challengers Bangalore players will sport the jerseys with the "My COVID Heroes" written on them all through the IPL to pay tribute to all those on the frontline in the battle against the pandemic. ## CA working in tandem with Royals over Smith's concussion

series due to the concussion suffered during training. "Cricket Australia has strict protocols when it comes to head impacts and concussions and, as we've seen over the last 12 months, we're not willing to compromise on those," CA's head of sports science Alex Kountouris said in a statement. "Steve is making progress and working with our medical team through the concussion protocols required to return to play," he added.

Kountouris said the franchise and CA will be working together to monitor Smith's fitness upon his arrival in the UAE. Smith had also endured a concussion during last year's Ashes game at the Lord's and subsequently missed a Test match.

Messi's perfectly placed pass sent Trincão clear for the Portugal forward to square the ball to Coutinho, who only had to scoop in the 20th-minute opener. Messi doubled the lead in the 45th with a shot from outside the area that went in off the upright. Samuel Saiz got Girona on the scoreboard after half-time before Messi got his brace with a shot that took a deflection off a defender to fool the Girona goalkeeper.

After missing a host of chances, another embarrassing setback looked likely for PSG until Metz goalkeeper Alexandre Oukidja failed to properly clear Angel Di Maria's cross from the left.


