Centre puts brakes to TS' ambitious vaccine drive

After CS letter, 3.62 lakh doses expected to reach State

NAVEENA GHANATE HYDERABAD

The Central government has effectively applied brakes to the Telangana government's ambitions, leaving the state with little choice but to slow down the Covid vaccination drive due to shortage of doses.

Following a letter from Chief Secretary Somesh Kumar requesting 30 lakh doses of vaccines, the Centre reportedly will be sending 3.62 lakh

doses on Monday night. Of these 3.62 lakh doses, two lakh are Covaxin and remain-


ing are Covisheild. This is just about 12 percent of the quantity requested by

Pointing that Telangana was left with only 5.66 lakh doses of Covid-19 vaccine that would last for 3 days at maximum, Somesh Kumar had on April 10 requested Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bushan to urgently provide at least 30 lakh doses of vaccine for the next 15 days. However, that was not to be.

The State's ambitious target to vaccinate 2 lakh people per day cannot be met if the supply is so low. The new stock would be consumed in merely two days and the state is again at the mercy of the

As on Monday, Telangana would have received 26.78 lakh doses, of which 22.58 lakh have been consumed.

Not just Telangana, Andhra Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Delhi, and Punjab have reported vaccine shortage. The states sought immediate replenishment of vaccine stocks to meet new targets set by the Central government as part of Tika Utsav.



India now has second-highest number of cases, passes Brazil

PNS NEW DELHI

India has surpassed Brazil to record the second-highest number of Covid-19 cases at 1,35,27,717, as a record 1,68,912 new infections were reported in a day.

The active cases have surpassed the 12-lakh mark, while the death toll increased to 1,70,179 with 904 new October 18, 2020, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated at 8 am on Monday. The national Covid-19 recovery rate has fallen below 90 percent

According to the Johns Hopkins University (JHU) data, India has overtaken Brazil, which is now at the third spot in the Covid tally with 1,34,82,023 cases. The US has the highest number of

cases at 3,11,98,055 while globally 13,61,36,954 cases have been reported.

Registering a steady increase for the 33rd day in a row, the active cases have increased to 12,01,009 in India comprising 8.88 percent of the total infections, while the recovery rate has further dropped to 89.86

No second dose during Tika Utsav

Only 16% in Telangana got second dose of vaccine

PNS HYDERABAD

Though 21.58 lakh doses have been administered three months into the vaccination drive, only 16.25 percent of those eligible could get the second dose of vaccine in Telangana so far. Shortage of vaccine doses is directly impacting the common man i.e. people above 45 who have taken first shot. In Telangana only 3 lakh people of the 18 lakh who took shots have received the second dose of vaccine. Except healthcare workers, hardly anybody is getting a second dose. Of the 2.3 lakh healthcare workers who took the first dose, nearly 1.7 lakh managed to get the second dose. About 75 percent of healthcare workers and 45 percent of frontline warriors have taken two doses of vaccines. Of the 1.5 lakh frontline workers in Telangana who took the first dose, 70,398 got the second

Panel recommends Sputnik V for use in India

An expert panel of India's central drug authority has recommended granting approval to Russian Covid-19 vaccine Sputnik V for restricted emergency use with certain conditions, paving the way for a third vaccine to be available in the country, sources said on

The Subject Expert Committee (SEC) of the Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO) on Monday deliberated upon the application of Dr Reddy's Laboratories seeking emergency use authorisation for Sputnik V.


"After detailed deliberation for grant of permission for restricted use in emergency situations subject to

various regulatory provisions," a source said. The recommendations have been sent to the Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) for final approval. If approved, it will be the third Covid-19 vaccine to be available in India after Bharat Biotech's Covaxin and Oxford-AstraZeneca's Covishield, being manufactured by Serum Institute of India in Pune.



Vaccinated people better protected: Experts

Covid vaccines protect against serious illness but transmissibility can still continue and inoculated people can pass on the infection to others, say scientists, warning against complacency in those who stop maintaining pro-

tocol after they get their jabs.

Transmissibility from vaccinated persons can be a risk factor until global coverage is achieved, top experts said as India's Covid numbers escalated sharply, reaching 1,35,27,717



(1.35 crore/13,5 million) with 1,68,912 new cases on Monday to make it the country with the second highest number of cases after the US.

Vaccination is simply one of the many different strategies we have to deal with in the pandemic. However, it is not a magical one-stop solution, immunologist Satyajit Rath, from the New Delhi's National Institute of Immunology, told.

None of the vaccines currently available provide protection against transmission of the virus. Statistically

speaking, infection post-vaccination is likely to be milder than one without, added Vineeta Bal, an immunologist from Pune's Indian Institute of Science, Education and Research.

As researchers around the world try and figure out how well Covid vaccines prevent vaccinated people from transmitting the virus to others, the experts stressed on the need for masks and physical distance regardless of the vaccination status. This has to continue until the majority of people are vaccinated.

Before the latest surge, the active caseload was at its highest at 10,17,754 on September 18, 2020 and had decreased to 1, 35,926

to the Secretariat regularly. Chief Ministers conduct departmental review meetings with the Minister, Secretary and other officials concerned. Like their respective bosses, the Ministers too have stopped coming to the

Secretariat in both the Telugu states. The situation is such that the IAS officers are now spending more time at the camp office of their respective Chief Minister than in the Secretariat. Old-timers recall Jalagam Vengala Rao with fondness for his punctuality and work ethics, compared to other Chief Ministers. "People used to set time on their watches upon seeing Vengala Rao's convoy pass on its way to the Secretariat," they say. "With the Telugu CMs

turning their camp offices into their regular office, the Secretariat itself appears forlorn since the Ministers, Secretaries and other IAS officers are not seen. In fact, both KCR and Jagan had adopted the 'Work From Home' culture much before Covid-19 entered the country," they said.

But when it comes to people above 45 years, 14.69 lakh took the first dose while only 58,245 managed to get the second dose in Telangana which is less than 4 percent. People who are booking appointments and getting confirmation are being sent back by hospitals. Understandably, hospitals have prioritised the first dose and people hoping to get their second shot are forced to keep on waiting. Many senior citizens are unable to get their second dose. Sushil, a citizen, said, "My

. March 9 at the ESI Sanathnagar. They were supposed to take their second dose but ESI has refused to give it to them citing lack of stock. Other private hospitals have also refused. citing preference for those who have taken first shot of vaccine from them." Another citizen N Anwar said, "I had confirmed appointment for getting vacci-Covaxin. Although the appointment was confirmed last week, upon reaching the hospital they refused to administer it, citing non-availability of Covaxin." Senior citizens are doing rounds of hospitals for vaccines but to no avail. Hospitals are voluntarily informing people about shortages on the second dose.

Mahender Yadav said, "I got my parents vaccinated with the first dose in Yashodha at Somajiguda. A hospital employee there told me to make a call one day before we check the availability of the vaccine. We are not getting vaccines from the Government as expected, so the second dose will be delayed."

The IMD said isolated heavy rainfall is also likely over south and ghat areas of Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Mahe, coastal and south interior Karnataka during April 14-16.

Another cyclonic circulation lies over southwest Madhya Pradesh and neighbouring areas. Under its influence, isolated rainfall with thunderstorm, lightning and gusty winds (30-40 kmph) is very likely over Madhya

Pradesh, Vidarbha, Telangana Chhattisgarh, Gangetic West Bengal and Odisha during next 4-5 days and over Jharkhand during next 24 hours. The scientists also batted for uni-

versal vaccination, saying it would provide strong community resistance to severe local outbreaks. Cautioning against lowering of the guard even after vaccination, they said some people who get inoculated early may lose their immunological memory over a period of time and become vulnerable again. Vaccination remains an individual protection, not a community protection, until we achieve almost global vaccination coverage. It is possible that vaccineresistant virus variants will emerge, necessitating steady watchfulness and the rapid development-deployment of next-generation vaccines, Rath said. Bal agreed that disease severity will be low in vaccinated individuals as compared to those without vaccination. Hence being vaccinated is a better state of affairs at a population level as well as individually, Bal said. Rath noted that if an individual is effectively vaccinated, meaning they develop robust long-lasting levels of neutralising antibodies, then reinfection with vaccine-sensitive SARS-CoV-2 strains, even if it happens, is likely to be associated with only mild illness.

Ón the other hand, he said, a new infection with vaccineresistant SARS-CoV-2 strains might still cause severe illness in some cases. So yes, vaccinated individuals could still pass on the infection, though the chance and the dose passed on would be lower. Of course, if they are infected with a future vaccineresistant virus strain, then efficient transmission could occur, he explained.

Quarantine breakers spread Covid

In spite of a family member testing positive for Covid-19, other family members are sweeping it under the carpet and freely mingling with others in streets and office, and this because of utter irresponsibility of some and compulsions of some others to show as if everything is okay, thereby

contributing to rapid spread of the virus in society.

A private employee of Attapur,Siddharth, lives with wife and children. Five days ago, his wife tested positive for the virus. Tests have revealed that his mother also tested positive for the virus. Scared of job loss, Siddharth did not apply for a leave to self-quarantine himself as 50 per cent of the staffers in Siddharth's office were laid off during the lockdown. He confined them to home isolation and kept the issue as a secret and reporting for work daily so as not to cause inconvenience to his colleagues.

According to the government norms, the person who was in primary or secondary contact with the Covid patient should quarantine themselves

This is not the only case of

Siddharth, who has broke the quarantine regulations, but there are many in the city, who are not revealing that their family members or they themselves are tested positive for the virus. Some due to the fear of stigma in the society, some others due to the fear of financial loss, which effects them if they stay indoors.

Now, because of such cases people are not able to know for sure how many in our vicinity has tested positive for virus. They have been spreading the virus further. One year ago, people took many precautions

when someone tested positive for the virus and checking halted the spread of the virus. Now-a-days, even if a neighbour tests positive for the virus, other do not know about it. If one were to test positive for the virus, one has to confine oneself to home for three to five weeks. His whole family members would have to refrain from working, pushing the family into financial problems. Therefore, people are not revealing corona positive cases and moving ahead spreading the virus to others.

Hyderabad Dinesh lives with wife and her parents, while his parents live in Tenali. Recently, his sister returned to Bengaluru from Sweden. Turning a deaf ear to all advice Dinesh's father went to Bengaluru to see his daughter, where he suffered a heart-attack. Dinesh had to go to Bengaluru to take care of his father. He lived with the family of his sister and her relatives there. After three days, there was a change in the health of all. Tests have revealed that 11 members of the family tested positive for the virus. In fact, the virus spread from Dinesh's contact with a Covid infected person. They did the reveal the matter until they were tested positive for the virus.

Not wearing of masks and observing precautions like sanitation and those who have confined themselves to home isolation for over seven to eight months have been moving carelessly thinking that there is let down in the cases. These have been spreading the cases further.

According to Bhimaraju, three members of his family tested positive for the virus while the two children of the family tested negative for it. He says that he lives in a single bedroom house. If the house owner knows that these many people tested positive for the virus he will take action of getting them vacated or so. That is why, he said he did not reveal it to anyone. For about two weeks, he projected a picture of everything was well. He said that he wanted to shift the family to Warangal upon testing positive for the virus and offered Rs 10,000 to taxi, but the taxi driver did not oblige. That is why, he and other family members kept it under wraps and living in Hyderabad.



Reduced testing size in state sees dip in daily corona tally

Relatively lower number of tests resulted in lower tally of new Covid-19 cases on Sunday. As per the bulletin for the 24 hours ending 8 p.m. on Sunday, 2,251 new cases were reported in Telangana.

The new infections pushed the state's cumulative tally to 3,29,529, according to the bulletin issued by the state government on Monday.

On Saturday, the state had reported an all-time high daily tally, since August, of 3,187 new cases from a record testing size of 1,15,371. In comparison, on Sunday, only 79,027 samples were tested.

Six people were reported dead due the virus, during the last 24 hours that ended 8 p.m. Sunday, taking the death toll to 1,765. The director of public health and family welfare, said the fatality rate stands at 0.53 per cent against the national average of 1.30 per cent.

The number of active cases jumped to 21,864, including 14,431 persons who are in

home/institutional isolation. A total of 565 people recovered from the pandemic during the last 24 hours, taking the cumulative recoveries to

slipped further to 92.82 per cent but is still above the national average of 89.9 per cent.

Greater Hyderabad reported 355 cases while its bordering districts, Medchal-Malkajgiri, and Rangareddy districts reported 258 and 200 cases respectively.

Ñizamaḃad district, bordering Maharashtra, reported 244 new cases, while Jagtiyal reported 117 new cases.

All the remaining districts except Mulugu reported fresh cases in double digits. Mulugu district reported the lowest daily tally of 7 cases.



Though the State parties of two Left parties are maintaining strategic silence on extending support to the TRS in the Nagarjunasagar by-elections, the District Committees have decided not to give support to



national parties--BJP and Congress-- and decided to extend their support to regional parties and as a part of it, they decided to extend their support to the TRS. The Left parties are against the BJP not only at the national-level but also state-level.

Speaking to The Pioneer, AICC official spokesperson Dasoju Sravan, said: "Left Parties are sold out to the ruling party. It is proved time and time again during the Huzurnagar by-elections, GHMC elections, graduate elections, and now Nagarjunasagar bypoll. Left parties are playing a Hippocratic role of dividing the anti-establishment vote rather than making an effort to unite the anti-establishment vote. Red flags are surren-

A political analyst has opined that the TRS has got an additional strength with the unofficial support of the Left parties. The ruling party already has an official supporter AIMIM party.

All set for auctioning of Trident Sugar Factory

The Sangareddy district authorities have fixed the time to dispose of the Trident Sugar Factory, earlier the Nizam Sugar Factory. In fact, the factory was set up on the outskirts of 'Kotturu' (B) village in Zaheerabad mandal.

On one hand, the government has been extending sup-Visakhapatnam Steel Plant' agitation while on the other hand, the local TRS leadership paying no attention to the problem, bemoaned farmers

and factory workers

The local people have been questioning the double standards of the control dards of the government on the sugar factory issue. A ruling TRS leader, who staged a fast demanding that the government clear dues to the sugar cane farmers and commence crushing in the sugar factory surprisingly turned a blind eye when the government deciding to dispose of the factory.

District Collector Hanmantha Rao has decided to auction the factory in the second week of May to clear dues of sugarcane farmers. The decision would affect the 200 workers directly and 1,500 indirectly. The decision would drive over 2,000 families on to the streets.

The fate of thousands of sugar cane farmers under the jurisdiction of the factory hangs in balance. The workers, who regard the closure of the factory as only temporary, are not able to digest the news of the permanent closure of the



District Collector Hanmantha Rao has decided to auction the factory in the second week of May to clear dues of sugarcane farmers. The decision would affect the 200 workers directly and 1,500 indirectly.

The farmers demanded that the cane commissioner, revenue, and police officials, who visited the factory recently, take steps to reopen the factory and clear their dues.

The management of Trident Sugar factory has been delaying payment of bills to sugarcane supplies for over two years. The crushing season for 2019-20 commenced rather late on December 3. During the season 1.11 lakh tonnes of sugar was crushed. Against payment of dues to the tune of Rs 34.31 crore, the factory management could clear only Rs 21.61 crore dues. The factory has suspended the 2020-21 crushing season tem-

The sugar cane farmers staged protests in front of the factory demanding payment of dues to them by the factory. The farmers and factory workers have been asking the ruling TRS government to mount pressure on the factory management to get their dues

cleared and factory reopened. They demand local TRS MLA Manik Rao, MP BB Patil and MLC Faridoddin to intervene in the matter and get the factory reopened. Otherwise, they urge the government to hand over the management to other factories or the farmers and workers.

The factory was set up in Kotturu (B) village by the then Congress government in 1972 due to the efforts of the then MLA late M Bagha

Fourth Covid wave: Affecting younger population more

PNS NEW DELHI

The fourth wave of the COVID-19 pandemic in Delhi is causing high-grade fever, spreading faster and affecting the younger population, especially those in the age group of 30 to 50, more, according to experts.

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has said the fourth wave is more dangerous than the previous ones and according to data available with him, 65 per cent of patients infected this time are below 45 years.

The sudden spike in COVID-19 cases in Delhi over the last few days and across the country has baffled medical experts.

Some doctors said the reason behind a large number of people contracting the infection this year vis-a-vis last year could be that the "virus has mutated" and the current strain is more infectious.

"The younger population goes out for work, uses public

transportation and hence, there are more chances of coming into contact with others. Many people are still not wearing masks or maintaining social distancing, which has contributed to the rise in cases," said Suranjit Chatterjee, a senior consultant at Apollo

He, however, pointed out that the number of deaths in Delhi is still much lower compared to what was recorded during the previous waves in June, September and

Thirty-seven doctors at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital in Delhi have tested positive for COVID-19 during the fourth wave of the pandemic. Of these, five have been admitted for treatment, hospital sources had said last Thursday.

Non-adherence to virus norms, virulent strains could be behind surge: Randeep

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

People not adhering to COVID-appropriate behaviour and the circulation of highly infectious strains of SARS-COV-2 could be the primary reasons behind the surge in coronavirus infections in India, AIIMS Director Dr Randeep Guleria said on Monday.

He also warned that if the situation is not reversed, then the galloping infection rate will eventually cause a huge strain on the country's health-care system. He sought stricter enforcement of COVID-appropriate behaviour on the ground level by the administration and out horities.

and authorities.

"Around February, when cases started to decrease, peo-



ple became lax towards following COVID-appropriate behaviour as they thought the virus had become ineffective.

People are taking the disease lightly now. If you go out, you see that marketplaces, restaurants and shopping malls are crowded and full of people and these all are super-spreader events," Guleria said.

Earlier, if one sick person

was able to infect around 30 per cent of their contacts, this time those getting the disease are infecting a larger number of people, he said.

"So the rate of spread of the

"So, the rate of spread of the infection is fast possibly due to the highly infectious and transmissible strains circulating," he added.

Various strains of SARS-CoV-2, including the UK, South Africa and Brazil variants, are circulating in India and have been termed as highly transmissible by experts.

Guleria said the entire humanity is going through a difficult time and "unless it is important, people should not venture out. Also, it has to be ensured that there is no gathering and stricte enforcement of COVID-appropriate behaviour has to be ensured".

"We may lose the gains we r have made so far if we do not pay heed now," and the situation may completely get out of control, he said.

"If the situation is not reversed, then the galloping infection rate will eventually cause a huge strain on the healthcare system also," he stressed.

The AIIMS chief also urged people to get vaccinated against COVID-19.

No golden rule

Armed Forces personnel react differently to different life-threatening situations

here are no golden rules for self-defence except that one has to gauge the gravity of the situation and act accordingly. Whether the security personnel deployed at West Bengal's polling stations would fire below or above the waist — especially as an agitated mob advances towards them — depends upon their threat perception and exigency. Even firing to kill is justified if the situation calls for it and if there are no other practical options. What is uncalled for in a certain situation can be well defensible in another. Recently, what happened in Sitalkuchi, Cooch Behar, is really unfortunate as four lives were lost in firing by the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) personnel and no amount of sympathy or compensation can bring them back.



However, what is more unfortunate is the blame game politics taking place between the BJP and the TMC. While Chief Minister and TMC chief Mamata Banerjee termed the incident "genocide", Union Home Minister Amit Shah said that her exhortation to gherao the Central forces had instigated the people to attack the CISF. Sceptics argue that the deaths could have been averted had the CISF jawans fired on their legs with the intention of dispersing the mob and not killing anybody — an argument echoed by Mamata. However, such suggestions are solely being made based on politicisation of the issue and are far from being practical; these people know noth-

ing about what is required to be done by a professional force under such circumstances and have no idea of how fast things develop on the ground.

It cannot be denied that when an agitated mob of 300-400 people advances towards a polling booth to ransack it or towards the security personnel with an intention of snatching their weapons or even killing them should they put up resistance, the use of mild or medium force can aggravate the situation. In such a situation, the use of means like lathicharge, water cannon, rubber bullets or teargas, instead of acting as a deterrent, can rather act as a provocation to the mob which then can charge the personnel with more ferocity. What would follow is a bloodbath in which the security personnel and common citizens both lose their lives in large numbers. To keep the body count low and to disperse the bloodthirsty mob, there is no practical option but to fire with the intention to kill as only that would act as a deterrent under such circumstances. However, such nitty-gritty and technical knowhow are an integral part of the training of any professional force which is deployed to maintain law and order. Mamata's allegations that the CISF has no experience in controlling mobs are more unfounded than real. However, there should be a thorough inquiry into the incident and those responsible for instigating the violence should not be spared. If the security personnel are at fault, strictest action must be taken against those responsible. But we expect our politicians not to do any further politics on the matter — at least not over the deaths. It's plain shameful.

Tikait flexes muscles

The farmers have renewed their dialogue call while throwing a challenge to the Haryana CM

t appears that Bharatiya Kisan Union leader and Samyukt Kisan Morcha linchpin Rakesh Tikait has returned to the protest theatre with renewed vigour after his sabbatical, a period he had advised his comrades to utilise harvesting the season's crop till next month. Freshly back after attending to their domestic chores and famil-



ial duties, the cultivators sitting on dharna since November 2020 along the Capital's borders already made their presence felt last weekend when they blocked the Ghazipur border in what they said was a "warning to the Government". Thousands among these protesters have come from Haryana, Punjab and western Uttar Pradesh, even though there now is a nationwide wave in support of their cause the repeal of the three agriculture legislations that, they say, have been enacted to benefit certain corporates. But now, it seems, the farmer leaders have opted to flexing their muscles even though they well realise that no important political decisions at the national level would be taken in earnest till the results

of elections to four States and a Union Territory are declared in early May. It is in this light that Tikait is taking the fight to Haryana Chief Minister ML Khattar's door by claiming that the latter wouldn't be allowed to enter Badauli village in Panipat, where the Chief Minister is scheduled to be on April 14 for unveiling a statue of Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar on the Dalit icon's birth anniversary. The farmer leader alleged that the actual reason for Khattar's visit was to "disturb the amity" among the area's cultivators "as per the BJP's plot". To avoid causing any imagined injury among Babasaheb's followers, Tikait also clarified that the farmers were not against the statue, they were against Khattar. In the same vein, however, ostensibly not to shut down any possible avenue which may lead to a dialogue with the Centre, the farmer leaders have also claimed that they are still willing to talk to the Centre on the three contentious Acts if invited for the same. Their only preconditions remain that the talks should resume where these were discontinued on January 22 and that their demands for total repeal remain unchanged. Well, though it seems like catch-22 without any quick resolution in sight, one would sincerely hope that under no situation would either side resort to any abhorrent step, such as violence.

Nepal staring at political disquiet RISHI GUPTA



The Nepal top court's decision not favouring Oli has come as a surprise and now his political survival hangs by a fine thread

fter long political and judicial scuffling in Nepal, its top court in two important verdicts nullified the dissolution of the democratically Parliament by the President and termed illegal the 2018 merger of the Communist Party of Nepal (Unified Marxist Leninist) and the Communist Party of Nepal (Maoist Centre) into the Nepal Communist Party (NCP), saying that another party existed with the same name. It means that the UML and the Maoist parties are back to their old selves.

While the reinstatement of the House comes as a big blow to Prime Minister KP Oli, who has emerged as an ultra-nationalist leader, an unexpected verdict on the future of a divided NCP has eventually put a full stop to the power struggle between the party chairs of the erstwhile NCP, Oli and Prachanda.

The verdict is being seen as an extrajudicial effort to save the country from plunging into political instability. Considering Oli's influence over the President's office, the Council of Ministers, Security Council, extraconstitutional bodies and the Press, it was believed that the court would favour Oli and acknowledge his faction as the legitimate NCP. That would have left Prachanda with no option but to form a new faction. Oli's legal team had also believed in a favourable verdict but the actual result has deepened the political crisis. Now, if the Maoists withdraw support, the Government will fall. The Madhesh-based Janata Samajbadi Party might prove to be the kingmaker as it can support the Nepali Congress and the Maoists to form a Government or ally with Oli to give further lease to his premiership.

An expected outcome: The 2018 merger of the two mainstream rivals had generated optimism among the Nepalese people that the new leadership was showing political maturity. However, it was only a matter of political survival for Oli and Prachanda as the former had group had come fully geared planned to weaken the to criticise India on the border



interest of their people. Hence, the fallout was inevitable. Blaming and seeking: With the eventual fall, Oli is seeking to mend ties with New Delhi. To reach out to India, he has appeared on a number of Indian news channels to cry foul against former Prime Minister Prachanda, blaming him for dividing the party. The same Oli created his political stronghold through his anti-India manoeuvring and bashing of the Indian media for being unfair towards the "victim" country.



dispute. These offices are now attempting all the tricks to reach out to New Delhi. Also, despite a projected bonhomie with China, Oli is pushing for the supplies of the COVID-19 vaccines from India.

However, testing the trust will be the core of India's new relations with Nepal. On the other hand, Oli's biased approach towards China had come at the cost of substantial economic losses. Also, he signed the Treaty on Mutual Legal Assistance with Beijing, endangering the lives and rights of 20,000 Tibetan refugees in Nepal. The Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) is an obsession with the current regime despite Sri Lanka's exposé of the Chinese wrong-

doings.
While Oli may call it a balancing act between India and China, his actions speak otherwise. The alleged soft funding from China to Oli's political adventures in Nepal through the Madan Bhandari Foundation needs no explanation to assert his bonhomie with the dragon.

Uncertain future: While the politicos do not wish for Nepal to plunge back into insurgency, Oli's authoritarian attitude has cost Nepal dearly.

Politically, democracy is a casualty considering Oli's dream of a one-party rule in Nepal, with no political opponents outside and within the UML.

On the foreign policy front, Nepal, with its vast hydropower potential, can use India's expertise in generating power. A mutually beneficial plan could have paved the way for Nepal's economic growth. However, far from new agreements, Nepal seems to have no plan to revitalise treaties like the Mahakali, signed in 1996 with India, which can generate cooperation between them. Meanwhile, false promises under the BRI and dreams of a trans-Himalayan railway with China have garnered Oli enough political capital.

Oli's aspirations, accompanied by hollow economic and development strategies, will lead Nepal towards an uncertain future which is being watched carefully by the people of Nepal and international actors, including India.

TIME TO REDEFINE RELATIONS WITH RUSSIA

 When Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov visited both New Delhi and Islamabad during his whirlwind tour, the visible and palpable warmth between the two nations at Islamabad was conspicuous by its absence in Delhi. Not mere photo ops, Russia's assurance to Pakistan on supply of highly sophisticated military equipment and the promise to conduct joint military exercise there does not bode well for India's interests. REMEMBERING THE 'GREATEST INDIAN'

Ambedkar did not seek equality only for Dalits but tried to bring all of India under the umbrella of his great ideals

few years ago, a major English TV news channel in the country started a drive to choose the "Greatest Indian" through online and mobile voting. The people of the country chose Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar as the "Greatest Indian." This is Babasaheb's greatest legacy. Unlike other leaders, he is still as relevant in the hearts of crores of Dalits and those who fight for a dignified life for underprivileged Indians, as he was in his time. As the country celebrates the 130th birth anniversary of Babasaheb on April 14, Ambedkar's struggle and values continue to inspire Indians and even the Black community in the US and others fighting discrimination across the globe. Ambedkar was different from other leaders in the sense that he encouraged the underprivileged to get their rights through education and political struggle. Despite all the protests, insults, reproach and neglect, he did not tread the path of violence and never dreamed of destroying the system. Staying within the confines of constitutional commitments, working within the system and changing it from within, were the hallmarks of his struggle



Babasaheb was not only the principal architect of the Indian Constitution, he firmly believed in the role of constitutional values in keeping the democratic system alive. Education, democratic struggle and unity were the core of his philosophy. He drew the path between socialist philosophy and communism for social justice. After the Round Table Conferences in 1931, the British proposed a separate electorate. When Madan Mohan Malaviya spoke to Babasaheb in this regard and envisaged its wider implications on Hindu society, Ambedkar agreed to have a more consistent reservation system for Dalits in place of a separate electorate. Thus, the historic Poona Pact of 1932 was signed. Ambedkar always fought for social justice and said that the scriptures that approve untouchability needed to be seen in the light of new knowledge. Ambedkar did not seek equality, fraternity and freedom only for the Dalits but also tried to bring the entire Indian society under the umbrella of his great ideals. When Pandit Nehru went back on his promise on the Hindu Code Bill, Ambedkar resigned from the Cabinet. Currently, while there is intense churning on its role in ensuring democracy and social justice on a global scale, Babasaheb has become more relevant than ever.

The values of dialogue, constitutional struggle and constant coordination are now playing an important role in making the present system more effective. Babasaheb had also made similar efforts in the process of nation building. Just as the Government is working to reestablish India as the "Vishwa Guru", Ambedkar, too, constantly strived for a global stature for Bharat. He was opposed to the prominence of competitive allegiance of religion, culture, caste and language. He believed that this made it difficult to cultivate Indianness and loyalty to India. He said, "I want people to be Indian first and to be Indian till the end, nothing but Indian.

Following in his footsteps, the Centre is not only ensuring social justice, but is also striving to bring the underprivileged into the mainstream through economic empowerment. 'Start-up India', 'Standup India', the National Scheduled Castes Finance and Development Corporation and scholarships for secondary and higher studies, are all efforts in this direction. On April 14, the whole world will salute Babasaheb, the true son of the nation, and his contribution towards nation building will be remembered. However, the younger generation must not only follow Babasaheb's ideals on his birth anniversary but every moment of their life.

Nix sovereign guarantee clause for the NaBFID



To bail out an entity majority-owned and controlled by private parties using the taxpayers' funds is a bad idea

In her Budget speech, Finance Minister (FM)
Nirmala Sitharaman had proposed setting up of
a new Development Financial Institution (DFI)
termed the National Bank for Financing
Infrastructure and Development (NaBFID). The Government passed a Bill to establish the NaBFID, its objective being "to coordinate with the Centre and States, regulators, financial institutions (FIs), institutional investors and other relevant stakeholders, in India or outside India, to facilitate building and improving the relevant institutions to support the development of long-term non-recourse infrastructure financing in India, including the domestic bonds and derivatives markets."

The NaBFID will also be involved "in lending or investing, directly or indirectly, and seek to attract investments from private sector investors and institutional investors, in infrastructure projects located in or outside India." It will also help provide financing options for projects under the muchtrumpeted National Infrastructure Pipeline (NIP). Under the NIP, the Union Government has identified over 7,000 projects in all crucial sectors such as roads, highways, railways, ports, power transmission lines, gas pipelines and so on, requiring an investment of over ₹100 lakh crore over the next

The Government will infuse ₹20,000 crore in NaBFID as budgetary support which will be leveraged to generate a financing capability of over ₹3,00,000 crore. This is peanuts when compared to the mammoth requirement of around ₹90 lakh crore (excluding about ₹10 lakh crore: ₹4,39,000 crore spent during 2020-21, plus a planned spending of ₹5,54,000 crore for 2021-22). But the moot question is whether the new DFI is a sustainable propo-

This is not the first time that the idea of a DFI has been floated. The first such institution, namely the Industrial Finance Corporation of India (IFCI), was set up in 1948, followed by the Industrial Development Bank of India (IDBI) in 1964. In the private sector, the Industrial Credit and Investment Corporation of India (ICICI) was set up in 1955. This was in sync with the global trend in Europe, Japan, the US and other Asian countries where the DFIs were set up primarily to rebuild infrastructure devastated by World War II. After the task was completed, those institutions were wound up. In India, how far these institutions (IDBI/IFCI) helped in building infrastructure is debatable. However, one thing is abundantly clear; they became a drain on the national exchequer through a variety of supports such as Government guarantees, capital commitments including from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) along with direct and indirect financing by the latter to meet their needs.

In the 90s, the Narasimham/Khan committees recommended — as part of the financial reforms package — their gradual phase-out. They were either required to transform into banks or close if they

The panels also recommended the development of domestic bonds and derivatives markets to galvanise investors to deploy their savings for long-term financing infrastructure projects. As a follow up, the then Vajpayee Government converted the IDBI into a commercial bank in 2003. The promoters of ICICI did this much earlier in 1994 by converting the institution into the ICICI Bank. However, the other most

crucial recommendation remained unattended. In the absence of sustainable arrangements for channelising household savings for long-term investment (a bank's source of capital is primarily short-term deposits resulting in what is termed as assetliability mismatch), currently much of infrastructure financing is done by the Government of India (GOI) by way of budgetary support.

The GOI, in turn, raises

resources — albeit for providing budgetary support — by imposing cesses, fees and other levies such as the Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF), the Permanent Bridge Fees Fund (PBFF) and monetisation of the National Highways Fund (NHF). For instance, during 2020-21, out of the ₹42,500 crore allocated to the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) for executing roads and highways projects, the contribution of the above-mentioned funds was 49 per cent, 27 per cent and 24 per cent respectively.

In this backdrop, and with the present arrangement meeting only a small portion of the mammoth funding needs (₹100 lakh crore under the NIP), setting up of dedicated institutions such as the NaBFID prima facie appears to be an attractive proposition. In fact, the Modi Government wants to use the NaBFID as an anchor DFI.

To begin with, the NaBFID will be 100 per cent owned by the GOI, with equity capital coming by way of budgetary support. Over a period of time, the latter will reduce its shareholding to 26 per cent, implying that the majority ownership and control fessionally-run body, with the Government only appointing the

The proposed structure of the new DFI points towards the Government going for a hands-off approach as the Act does not provide for an oversight mechanism; it will be free from the "three Cs" i.e. the Central Bureau of Investigation, the Central Vigilance Commission and the Comptroller and Auditor General of India. In fact, it goes a step forward by seeking to protect the management for the decisions taken as an "act of good faith." Up to this point, things are hunky-dory.

However, problems begin to creep when we look at this: "The Act empowers the GOI to extend sovereign guarantee in case of a default." The guarantees cover a wide range like any liabilities of its own subsidiaries, joint ventures, branches and other similar arrangements; letters of comfort, or letters of credit for loans or bonds and debentures issued by any DFI funding infrastructure projects in India; and guarantee of the simplified processes, enforcement of NaBFID's bonds, debentures, loans and borrowings from multilateral institutions, sovereign wealth funds (SWFs), and other foreign institutions. To bail out an entity majorityowned and controlled by private parties using the taxpayers' funds is a bad idea. Furthermore, to do this when the Government is not even exercising any external oversight makes it abhorrent. The FM's defence that "an audited report would be placed in Parliament every year, besides the

and the RBI a copy of its balance sheet and accounts, together with a copy of the auditor's report and a report of its working during the relevant year, within four months from the date on which its accounts were closed and balanced" does not inspire confidence.

One shudders to fathom the contingent liabilities emanating from the above open-ended guarantees provided under the Act and their impact on the fiscal deficit (FD). Already, the FD for 2021-22 is put at 6.8 per cent of the Gross Domestic Product which is almost double of what is permitted under the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management. For 2025-26, the FM puts it at 4.5 per cent. The NaBFID Act would result in spi-

ralling of these numbers. Team Modi needs to take a relook at the "sovereign guarantee" clause in the NaBFID Act. It should be deleted. As for giving comfort to investors, if only project proponents can generate the desired cash flows (this would require transparency and efficiency in project execution, contracts, freedom from bureaucratic red tape and above all, realistic pricing of services shorn of populism), this will be automatically assured.

On the other hand, if these prerequisites are lacking, resulting in shortfall in cash flows, then even the offer of sovereign guarantee won't provide much comfort even as the NaBFID, too, will end up being a drain on the exchequer just as the erstwhile IDBI.

India will come out of Covid crisis with flying colours: Deloitte CEO

India will come out of the COVID-19 crisis that has impacted the entire world with flying colours, Deloitte CEO Punit Renjen has said, asserting that the 21st century is "India's century".

Renjen said the Indian government has performed well in addressing the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

"This is India's century and I'm convinced about it," the 60year-old prominent Indian-American business leader told PTI in an interview.

"I am certainly a little biased given my (Indian) heritage but I'm actually convinced that this is India's century because of just the raw talent that exists in India, the number of people that comprise India, the democratic tradition that has been around for 75 years," he said.

Observing that the pandemic impacted everyone, Renjen said the pandemic impacted India very hard, given the lockdown that the government had to put in place, given the size of the population and what the virus potentially could do to India. The Rohtak-born Indian-American CEO, who has been

Fall in gold prices may not impact NBFCs asset quality

The recent fall in gold prices is unlikely to affect the asset quality of non-banking finan-cial companies (NBFCs) lending against gold in a considerable manner, according to a report.

aggressively disbursing gold loans during the last fiscal may see some impact on their asset quality, Crisil Ratings said in a report.

On a 30-day rolling basis, the gold price has corrected around 10 per cent over the past six months, while on an absolute basis it has fallen twice that rate.

"The correction in gold prices in recent months is not expected to materially impact the asset quality of NBFCs lending against gold," the agency said.

Apart from periodically collecting interest over the past few fiscal, NBFCs have that dishursemen loan-to-value (LTV) is maintained below 75 per cent, it said. For NBFCs, the average portfolio LTV as of December 31, 2020, was close to 63-67 per cent, while the average LTV on incremental disbursements in the October-December 2020 quarter was around 70 per

Lighting and steel pipe products maker Surya Roshni on Monday said it has bagged an order worth Rs 299 crore for supply of carbon steel line pipes to Numaligarh Refinery Ltd for Paradip Numaligarh Crude Oil Pipeline project in Odisha.

"The company has obtained an order amount of Rs 299.07 crore (excluding GST) for supply of... external coated carbon steel line pipes to Numaligarh Refinery for Paradip Pipeline project," Surya Roshni said in a regulatory filing.

The order is to be executed within 15 months, it added.

Shares of Surya Roshni were trading 6.87 per cent lower at Rs 359.15

The IMF official underscored the significance of investments into financial institutions, into oversight, and into infrastructures to ensure that the "financial system can absorb shocks and that is sustaining growth a long-term way.

India, he said, is on the right track and is innovating on the policy side.

"It has been quite innovative on digital identity, for example. I think no country is laying like India in that respect," he said, noting that the country needs to capture all the segments of the financial market and financial institutions to make sure that every piece fits together like a puzzle to fuel growth in

The general lesson from the COVID-19 crisis, he said, is that when the terrible adverse shock hits one need to aggressively supply liquidity.
Secondly, the fiscal support

Moon says EV battery settlement 'meaningful'

South Korean President Moon Jae-in on Monday welcomed a decision by two South Korean electric vehicle battery makers to settle a long-running intellectual property dispute that had threatened thousands of American jobs and President Joe Biden's environmental policies. In agreeing to pay 2 trillion won (USD 1.8 billion) to LG Energy Solution over stolen trade secrets, SK Innovation can now move ahead with plans to manufacture batteries in Georgia for electrically powered Ford pickup trucks and

Volkswagen SUVs. In a series of tweets, Moon said the companies' last-minute settlement on Sunday was "for-



tunate" and "very meaningful' and would help stabilise global supply chains in a fast-moving industry that's experiencing growing pains.

South Korea's Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy in a press release called for "stronger cooperation and solidarity" between South Korean battery companies which should now focus on "preparing for the future in face of intense global competition." The agreement between the companies averted an intervention by Biden in a case closely watched for its implications for his clean-energy agenda, which includes drastically increasing use of electric vehicles to help address climate

change.

Biden had until Sunday night to decide whether to step in, following a February ruling by a trade commission. He called the agreement a "win for American workers and the

American auto industry." In a regulatory filing to South Korean financial authorities, SK Innovation said it will provide LG Energy a lump-sum payment of 1 tril-lion won (\$888 million) and

The United Nations has estimated that this may have caused an additional 2,20,000 child deaths and 11,000 maternal deaths in South Asia alone. These numbers are likely to increase with India potentially accounting for the largest proportions. In India, the number of women who received all four antenatal check-ups during the pandemic also dropped by 51 per cent and the number of institutional deliveries were down by 79 per cent. The demand for family planning services satisfied by modern methods fell by 67 per cent.






