INDIA CROSSES 2-LAKH DAILY COUNT

The emergence of several States as new Covid-19 hotspots besides Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and Kerala continued to push the daily count of fresh infections to newer peaks as several States imposed new lockdown like restrictions on Thursday to battle the alarming surge that saw India recording over 2 lakh cases during the last 24 hours.

While Maharashtra's tally rose marginally from the previous day, ending at 61,695 new cases and 349 deaths, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Haryana, and Bihar have seen alarmingly higher spikes on daily basis.

After Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh, Uttar Pradesh has emerged as the third-highest contributor of new cases on a daily count. The State reported 22,339 new cases and 104 deaths during the last 24 hours.

Uttar Pradesh was followed by Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh. While the southern States reported 14,738 new cases and 66 deaths during the last 24 hours, MP reported 102,166 cases and 53 deaths.

Gujarat recorded 8,152 new cases and 81 deaths, while Tamil Nadu clocked 7,987 cases and 29 deaths.

Meanwhile, in view of the alarming surge in the Covid-19 cases and high occupancy of patients in the Dedicated Covid Hospitals, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC)

on Thursday converted famed Jaslok Hospital into a dedicated Covid-19 hospital.

ASI closes monuments for visitors till May 15

New Delhi: All Centrally protected monuments, museums and sites under the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) have been closed with immediate effect till May 15 due to the surge in coronavirus cases in the country, the Union Culture Ministry said on Thursday. An order to this effect was issued by the ASI and it was tweeted by Culture Minister Prahlad Patel on Thursday evening.

At present, corona curfew is being enforced in these districts between 9 pm and 6 am. To prevent the spread of the disease among the children and safeguard them from the second wave of coronavirus infection, the CM said schools up to Class 12 should be closed till May 15. He instructed the officials to make all necessary arrangements in view of the changing situation every day in all the districts of the State. Yogi assured the State was successful in fighting the first wave of Covid-19 and similarly, this time the second wave will also be controlled soon.

"For this it is required that all citizens strictly adhere to Covid protocols such as masks, sanitizers and social distancing. Not only this, it is better that people include this protocol in their lifestyle. People should be made aware about this," he said.

In a bid to ensure an effective Covid-19 management system, Yogi said inflow of patients from other districts in Lucknow is natural.

Therefore, we need to make additional arrangements here. In such a situation, KGMU and Balrampur Hospital should be prepared as a dedicated Covid Hospital, he said.

Kumbh sees 0.7% Covid positivity rate

Confirming the fears of the experts that the mega religious congregation of Kumbh in Haridwar would accelerate the pace Covid-19 infection, the authorities on Thursday confirmed that 1,700 people were tested positive for the disease from April 10 to 14 in the Mela area.

The Kumbh Mela which is considered as the biggest religious congregation in the world officially started on April 1.

The medical workers conducted 2,36,751 tests during the five-day period (April 10 to 14) in the Mela area. Out of these, 1,701 samples came out positive for Covid-19, that means 0.7 per cent positivity rate.

It is learnt that in the Kumbh area a number of the Sadhus belonging to different Akhadas and sects have been reported positive for the disease.

The death of Mahamandaleshwar Kapil Dev Dass Naga belonging to the Akhil Bharatiya Nirvani Akhada due to Covid-19 has come as a shock among the members of the Akhada.

The ascetic belonging to Chitrakoot in Madhya Pradesh was in Haridwar to attend the Kumbh. The ascetic was admitted in a private hospital in Dehradun after he was found positive for Covid-19 in Haridwar on April 12.

Covid tally crosses 1.5L mark in State

Active caseload above 20K; Over 3,500 found infected, 28 die

The Covid tally in Jharkhand crossed the 1.5 lakh mark, while the active caseload jumped above 20,000 on Thursday as the State reported close to 3,500 Covid cases and 28 casualties in 24 hours, figures compiled by the National Health Mission (NHM) highlighted.

The 28 deaths reported on Thursday took the Covid toll in the State to 1,320. As per a bulletin released by the NHM, at least nine of the 28 Covid victims were Dhanbad residents, while five deceased were from Ranchi. East Singhbhum reported four casualties on the day and Koderma reported two. At least five districts — Simdega, West Singhbhum, Ramgarh, Godda and Deoghar — reported one Covid death each.

Ranchi continued to report the highest share of Covid cases among the 24 districts on

Thursday. As per NHM data, as many as 1,393 cases in the districts took the active caseload

here to 8,666.

Ranchi accounts for around 40 per cent of the 20,651 active cases in the State. Meanwhile, East Singhbhum also reported 492 cases against 264 recoveries on the day. The active caseload there reached 2,504 on the day.

At least five other districts — Hazaribag, Koderma, Dhanbad, Deoghar and Bokaro — reported a triple-digit-spike in cases on the day. Ranchi and Dhanbad, however, continued to lead in terms of Covid casualties in the State. Thursday's findings took the Covid toll in Ranchi to 335 and that in East Singhbhum to 392.

The Government on Thursday tested swab samples of 36,349 Jharkhand residents and around 10 per cent of them were found infected. So far, as many as 1,51,272 people have

been infected by the mysterious virus in Jharkhand and 85.47 per cent of them have recovered, reveals Government data.

In the past couple of weeks, the growth rate of infection has seen a spike while the doubling rate has dropped in Jharkhand. On Thursday, the growth rate of infection in Jharkhand was 1.67 per cent against the national average of 0.91 per cent. The doubling rate in the State was 41.85 days against the national doubling rate of 76.16 days.

Meanwhile, the State on Thursday administered the first dose of vaccine against Covid-19 to as many as 30,054 people, about 41 per cent of those registered. The second dose was administered to as many as 7,439 people, only 3 per cent of the over 2.7 lakh registered for the jab on the day.

WEEKEND LOCKDOWN IN DELHI

Fresh Covid cases soar to over 17,000 on Thursday

As the Covid-19 situation in the national Capital turned grimmer with the number of daily cases rising to staggering over 17,000, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday announced imposition of weekend curfew to break the chain of coronavirus infection.

The Chief Minister announced that weekend curfew will be implemented in Delhi along with a closure of malls, gyms, swimming pools, and auditoriums. The cinema halls will function at 30 per cent capacity and restaurants will not be allowed to cater to dining — only home delivery

and takeaways will be allowed.

The weekly markets will be allowed at one weekly market per-day-per-zone format and the Delhi Government will also monitor crowds at weekly markets and the markets and public places will see stricter implementation of Covid norms.

Kejriwal appealed to the people of Delhi to not insist on getting admitted to a particular hospital as beds will be made available in other facilities if required as Delhi has more than 5,000 beds vacant.

Addressing the media, he said, "Corona cases are rising in Delhi but the hospital management in Delhi is under control. There is no dearth of

beds in Delhi as more than 5,000 beds are available. We met with the Lieutenant Governor and have unanimously decided to put a weekend lockdown in place. Our understanding is that people need to travel during weekdays for work and other essential activities; however, weekends are usually reserved for leisure and entertainment activities — activities that in the given situation can be curtailed and restricted," he said.

Keeping in mind the essential nature of work and jobs done during weekdays, the Government has decided to issue curfew passes.

"We will also monitor crowds at weekly markets and

release guidelines pertaining to this as well. Dining at restaurants will no longer be allowed, one can avail of the home delivery and takeaway method for now. Markets, public places etc. will see a stricter implementation of Covid norms," he added.

Kejriwal said, "We have been noticing a callous attitude in terms of wearing masks, observing social distancing, this is not good for safety and security." Delhi reported 17,282 Covid-19 cases on Wednesday while 104 more people succumbed to the disease. The active cases reached to 50,736 in Delhi and containment zones rose to 7,598 on Wednesday.

No plan to club rest 4 phases in Bengal: EC

All-party meet called to discuss Covid-19 norms

Dismissing speculation that the final four phases of the ongoing Assembly elections in West Bengal could be clubbed due to an exponential rise in daily cases of Covid-19 across the country, the Election Commission (EC) on Thursday said there is no plan of clubbing the remaining phases.

EC officials said that the chief electoral officer (CEO) of West Bengal has called an all-party meeting in Kolkata on Friday to discuss adherence to Covid-19 guidelines issued by the poll commission. All political parties have been asked to send one representative for discussion over following Covid-19 related protocol for the last four phases of the poll.

This comes after the ECI,

last Friday, sent a letter to all political parties in the fray in the eastern State, mentioning that instances of elections campaigns/meetings, in which social distancing norms, wearing of masks were flouted were brought to its notice.

The letter re-emphasised Covid-19 protocols issued ahead of last October-November's Bihar Assembly elections, as well as by-elections in various States, the first elec-

toral exercise to be conducted since the pandemic began.

The EC has come under fire for scheduling the Assembly polls in West Bengal in eight phases. Earlier in the day on Thursday, Mahua Moitra of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's ruling Trinamool Congress (TMC) slammed the ECI over the scheduling of the polls, calling it "criminal negligence bordering on manslaughter."

Foreign vax applications to get DCGI decision within 3 days

New Delhi: The country's top drug regulator, Drug Controller General of India (DCGI), will take a decision on applications seeking approval for restricted emergency use of foreign-produced Covid-19 vaccines within three working days from the date of submission, the Government said on Thursday.

The decision will facilitate quicker access to such foreign vaccines by India and would encourage imports, including that of bulk drug material, optimal utilisation of domestic ones. This will in turn provide a fillip to vaccine manufacturing capacity and total vaccine availability within the country, said the Union Health Ministry in a statement here.

The move comes at a time when India is battling a surge in coronavirus infections with over two lakh cases reported in a single day on Thursday. Recently, the DCGI had approved Sputnik V, a Russian-manufactured jab, the third in the Indian vaccine

basket which so far had Covaxin and Covishield.

However, now with growing demand for vaccination for all, the Government has issued the Regulatory Pathway in India for Covid-19 vaccines approved for restricted use by US FDA, EMA, UK MHRA, PMDA Japan or which are listed in WHO Emergency Use Listing (EUL).

As per the proposal, the DCGI shall prepare detailed guidelines specifying regulatory pathway for approval of foreign approved Covid vaccines based on NEGVAC recommendations.

"Application can be made by the foreign manufacturer through its Indian subsidiary or through its authorised agent in India (in case it does not have an Indian subsidiary). The DCGI will process such applications for restricted use in emergency situation and take a decision within three working days from date of submission of complete application by the applicant." PNS

Is the Pharaoh's curse blamed for the Suez Canal blockage?

Death will come on quick wings for those who disturb the king's peace," reads a curse written on King Tut's tomb in Egypt. Rather than taking a logical scientific explanation, an inscription on an ancient tomb, widely circulated is gaining attention worldwide.

The mummies of Egypt in the past have often been linked with superstition and bad luck. With the Suez canal blockage disturbing global markets, two trains running into each other, a garment factory blaze and the collapsing of a residential building in Egypt; followed with the country's announcement that

On April 3, 2021, the mummified remains of 22

ancient Egyptian kings and queens were paraded through the streets of Cairo, capital of Egypt. Most of the mummies belonged to the ancient New Kingdom, which ruled Egypt between 1539 BC and 1075 BC.

They had resided there for more than a century. Under heavy security these mummies were moved from the museum where they actually resided to a new home. The mummified remains of the 'pharaohs' along with the other royals were transported in climate controlled cases and was loaded onto a truck that was decorated with wings and pharaonic designs for the hour-long jour-

ney from their previous Egyptian Museum.

The procession was carried by the military band with 21-gun salute and was broadcasted live on State television. The mummies were moved from the Egyptian Museum in central Cairo's Tahrir Square to the National Museum of Egyptian Civilization in Fustatand.

It is believed that these mummies were originally buried some 3,000 years ago in secret tombs in the Valley of Kings and the nearby Deir el-Bahri site.

Both areas are near the southern city of Luxor. Excavation of the tomb was done in the 19th century for the

first time. After that, these mummies sailed through the Nile and were taken to Cairo in boats. Few of the mummies were showcased in glass cases, while the rest were stored. The remains of Ramses II were taken to Paris in 1976 for intensive restoration work by French scientists. This is not the first time that mummies were transferred from one place to another. Even in 1881, mummies were taken from Luxor, put in a boat for three days until they reached Cairo. Furthermore, mummy of Ramses II once had its strips of linen removed in front of khedive Tewfik (Egypt's ruler in the late 19th century) but nothing happened.

It is assumed that the prime motive of this parade was to attract foreign tourists by publicising its ancient memorials. The tourism industry has suffered from political turmoil — following the 2011 popular uprising that ousted longtime autocrat Hosni Mubarak, and more recently, the coronavirus pandemic.

Many believe that a curse would be cast upon anyone who disturb the mummies of ancient Egypt. However, a famous Egyptologist Zahi Hawass mentioned that the supposed curse of the pharaohs does not have any relation to the events happening in the country. It is

understood that it was unusual for all these incidents to occur one after the other at the same time after the decision to shift the mummies was announced. But there has to be a bigger reason why they have happened — rather than just a run of devastatingly bad luck. This parade is, rather, a proof of the greatness of a unique civilisation that extends into the depths of history. Moreover, it is Egypt's biggest promotion in order to invite tourists to return to Cairo after the pandemic.

The COVID-19 situation in the city is turning grave with death tolls rising every day. In the last 24 hours five more deaths were reported alone five deaths were reported. Those who died included Kadma 73 year woman and a resident of Chaibasa. Covid cases have crossed 22000 mark in the steel city. The deadly virus has claimed about 407 lives in the East Singhbhum district. The East Singhbhum district administration has also started a massive public awareness campaign against Covid-19. The Jamshedpur Notified Area Committee (JNAC), the local urban civic body pressed into service awareness campaign vehicles in areas under its jurisdiction. Similarly, the other two civic bodies - Mango Notified Area Committee (MNAC) and Jugsalai Municipality rolled out awareness vehicles. Apart from this,



announcements with the help of the public address system were made in Bistupur Sakchi and other markets. An appeal was made to follow the social distancing norms and make use of marks. Elderly persons and children below 10 years were asked not to venture out of their house as they are the most vulnerable group. The district administration has imposed restrictions in different areas in view of rising COVID-19 positive cases in the city. A team from district police, Jamshedpur Notified Area Committee (JNAC) led a drive to sensitise people to wear face masks and ensure personal distancing while venturing out to carry out their essential works in the wake of

the COVID-19 pandemic. A senior health officer said people should avoid visiting thickly populated places as far as possible. Though it is a festive season, people should avoid crowded places. "If people ensured social distancing norms, the situation could be brought under control within three weeks," the official noted. Deaths have started taking place of the persons hailing from very densely-populated localities of the city whereas asymptomatic COVID patients are present in an overwhelming number in the steel city. "We have noticed that a number of positive cases are coming from areas that are densely populated like Mango, Jugsalai and Kadma. Business and residential areas located in Sakchi are vulnerable. Crowded marketplaces and densely populated residential areas surrounding them are emerging as COVID-19 hotspots in the city," noted an official.

Police launch campaign to sensitise people about face masks

The spread of corona infection is increasing rapidly in Bokaro Thermal and it's surrounding areas. Every day people are getting infected, despite no improvement being seen in the habit of people on the way. People are still roaming without a mask. The latest example was seen on Thursday. While the Block development officer and Bokaro Thermal police in the district carried out intensive mask checking operation on Thursday, in which several drivers were seen without a mask. In last two weeks more than two dozen people have reached the hospital after getting corona infected. In the same 12 days, three people have also died due to infection of Covid-19 including DVC Chief Engineer and project head and his PA.

People escape Covid test at station and bus stand

Dhanbad: Railway and bus passengers are giving a ditch to district administration as far as its testing of Covid positive patients is concerned. The issue came to fore as people saw a large number of passengers leaving trains and buses coming from other states at stations and locations having no facility for corona test. The district administration has made arrangements for corona test at Dhanbad railway station for passengers coming from different states and bus passengers at Bartand bus stand. However, hundreds of passengers coming from Alleppey express train from South were seen leaving the train at Katrasgarh Station that is the second last station of this Dhanbad bound train. In the last one week including today more than a thousand passengers though had tickets up to Dhanbad left train at Katrasgarh Station.

SAILs Super Specialty Hospital at Rourkela to be used as Covid Care Hospital

Bokaro: Steel Authority of India Limited's Super Specialty Hospital at Rourkela is approved to be used as Covid Care Hospital. Minister of Steel and PNG, Dharmendra Pradhan had instructed to use SAIL Super Specialty Hospital at Rourkela as COVID-19 care hospital in wake of rising cases in the region. SAIL has always stood in readiness and has actively contributed in the nation's fight against COVID-19. The local district authori-



ty had also sent a request for utilizing the ICU facilities of the Super Specialty Hospital for treatment of Covid-19 patients. The 60 bedded ICU facility of SAIL-RSP will be used for COVID-19 care. This hospital will further augment the treat-

ment facilities for covid patients in the state. Sharing information COC BSL Manikant Dhan said SAIL always stood shoulder to shoulder in fighting the pandemic since its onset last year. The company contributed Rs 30 crore to the PM CARES fund along with employees donating a day's salary to the fund. Covid-19: Big spike in Bokaro with 130 new positive cases

BOKARO: Bokaro saw a major spurt in fresh COVID-19 cases on Thursday. The district recorded 130 new positive cases of coronavirus in a single day surge which is the highest one of this year. These new cases also include a magistrate and 24 others engaged at judiciary services, informed AK Pathak Civil Surgeon Bokaro. The overall number of reported cases in the district rushed to 640 while the district's death toll stands at 74, including two on Wednesday. "All have been shifted to COVID Hospital, and contact tracing of all is being done," he added. Meanwhile, 39 patients were recovered and discharged from the hospital, said Pathak. Expressing concern over the huge spurt in positive cases in the district, Rajesh Kumar Singh, DC Bokaro said, more security and vigilance are necessary. "Everyone needs to be cautious," he added. Masks must be applied, follow social distance; wash your hands with soap at regular intervals. The best way is for all of you to be safe in your own homes, he appealed. In view of the rising outbreak of global epidemic COVID-19, Deputy Commissioner has issued an order stating that "all officers and employees of their respective offices are prohibited from leaving the headquarters without the permission of the Deputy Commissioner." An official or employee can be called at any time, in case of their absence, action would be taken under the relevant sections of the Disaster Management Act., he said.

Govt girds loins to curb Covid-19 cases in State

2 new machines, 6 labs for RTPCR test; 110 fresh ICU beds at RIMS

PNS ■ RANCHI

Several important decisions were taken in view of the increase in Corona infection cases in the State in a high-level meeting at the Chief Minister's residence here on Thursday under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Hemant Soren. The CM directed the Health Department to buy two machines of Cobas Company to expedite the Covid-19 (RTPCR) tests. A unit of COBAS machine can test 1400 RTPCR samples every day. One machine will be installed in Ranchi and one machine in Dumka.

Also, the CM directed the departmental officials to establish 6 new RTPCR laboratories

in the State. These laboratories will be established in Ranchi, Jamshedpur, Bokaro, Chaibasa, Gumla and Sahebganj. It was also decided to setup 110 new ICU beds in RIMS Ranchi as well as reserve 750 Covid-19 dedicated beds in RIMS. In view of the increasing pressure of corona infection in Ranchi, the Chief Minister directed to reserve 150 bedded hospital of CCL established in Ramgarh district for dedicated Covid-19 patients. The CM said that as time progresses, the government will continue to take a decision to stop the spread of Covid-19.

Soren directed the concerned people of all districts to keep at least 50 per cent beds in all government and private hospitals of the State reserved for corona patients. All the Deputy Commissioners should meet

with the managers of all the private hospitals of the districts and prepare an action plan as soon as possible to ensure the treatment of the corona infected patients. The CM also directed to arrange extra beds and oxygen-rich beds in all hospitals. He said that in order to control the Covid-19 cases in recent times and increase in the coming days, effective arrangements

should be made by making a comprehensive strategy for treatment at the district, block and village level. Ensure full utilization of the resources established under clinical management. He said that the State Government is serious to prevent the spread of Corona infection.

In the meeting, the CM said that corona infection is increasing rapidly in the State. "Keep in

mind which areas the new case is moving more. Keep full knowledge of which people have come from other states. Analyze the causes of infection and work on a strategy based on prior experiences. All the Deputy Commissioners should arrange for maximum testing of Covid-19 in their respective districts," he said.

The CM said that the instructions issued by the government in public events and activities should be 100 per cent adhered to. In crowded places, people should take special vigilance and focus on it. He instructed all the appropriate people to remain fully alert keeping in mind the upcoming challenges.

At the meeting, the Chief Secretary of the State, Sukhdev Singh, took detailed information from the Deputy

Commissioners of all the districts regarding the latest information and preparations for the corona infection. The CS said that the work of reserving 50 per cent beds for Covid-19 patients in all hospitals should be ensured at the earliest. Maximum oxygen-rich beds should be prepared in hospitals. Ensure that the corona infected patients do not suffer from any kind of treatment.

In the meeting, Health Minister Banna Gupta, Chief Secretary Sukhdev Singh, Principal Secretary to Chief Minister Rajiv Arun Ekka, Health Secretary KK Soan, Disaster Management Secretary Mr. Amitabh Kaushal, Urban Development Secretary Vinay Choubey, Deputy Commissioners and Civil Surgeons of all districts (Except Deoghar) were present.

Special train reaches Ranchi with 1,350 migrants

Covid test of workers conducted at stations

Amid talks of a complete lockdown in Maharashtra and other states to arrest the Covid 19 surge, large numbers of migrant labourers have started flocking to their home State. On Thursday early morning at around 3.30 am, a workers batch reached Ranchi from Mumbai in a Special Train. The workers reached Hatia railway station where the district administration had made elaborate arrangements for receiving the migrant workers. Around 1350 workers from Lokmanya Tilak Terminus reached the Hatia station.

The district administration had made elaborate arrangements with all passengers going for a rapid antigen test. Ranchi Railway Division CPRO Neeraj Kumar said, "Rapid antigen test was carried on all the passengers reaching Ranchi. The district administration had made elaborate arrangements. Dedicated teams of district

administration were at Ranchi railway station for testing the passengers."

Sources said that the second wave of Covid infections is sparking another reverse migration of workers returning to their home states from places reporting sharp increases in cases.

Jharkhand is one such state to which people have started to return after several big cities imposed curbs, night curfews and lockdowns to tackle the second wave of Covid.

The workers claim that the situation is very disturbing in Mumbai and other cities. Anil Kumar Rai, who works as a supervisor at a textile mill in

Mumbai and returned back to his native Palamu district recently said, "The second wave of corona is very dangerous as daily caseload is much larger than previous year. Also the mortality rate is higher. We decided to leave Mumbai as every day Maharashtra is making strict rules and we fear that on any day the government will announce lockdown in the state."

Rai said, "To avoid last year's situation when the lockdown was announced without much information to the public, bringing all activities to a standstill. As all train services were stopped we were left with no other alternative but to hire

private cars at higher fare for reaching our destinations."

Sources said that each day, hundreds of migrants are returning to Ranchi and other parts of the state from Maharashtra, Punjab, Delhi and Telangana and dispersing to their homes.

For passengers reaching Ranchi and Hatia Junction there is a facility of corona test. The Railways are requesting passengers to carry out tests at test centres at Railway Junction.

Railway is also creating awareness about corona. As per corona protocol made by Disaster Management Authority, passengers have to follow corona protocol such as wearing masks, use of sanitizers and maintaining social distance.

However, sources said that due to rush of passengers from western States, corona protocol is not being followed completely.

The trains are running with full occupancies, however, the railway has discontinued the facilities of pantry cars in these trains. Passengers are advised to carry food packets from their homes.

State BJP to conduct relief work for Covid-19

Bharatiya Janata Party state president cum MP Deepak Prakash today expressed concern over the growing cases of corona, saying that coronavirus has taken a dangerous form in the State. Ranchi: Former Union Minister and senior Congress leader Subodh Kant Sahay today said, "This colossal COVID calamity is the direct result of Modi's callousness and obsessive pre-occupation with State elections, particularly West Bengal. The negligence and non-readiness in the health infrastructure has been brutally exposed. The general health preparedness of the country has deteriorated further during the pandemic exposing the loud claims made by PM and his ministers. After CBSE, Govt likely to cancel JAC board exams

CM to take decision today

"Given the current situation, it would be difficult to hold the exams from May 4. The state government will take a final call on whether we need to postpone the exams or cancel them," said JAC chairperson Arvind Prasad Singh.

Meanwhile, the Jharkhand Parents' Association (JPA), the largest parents' association in the state, shot letters to JAC and ICSE on Thursday seeking necessary changes in the exam schedule in the wake of the Covid-19 situation in the state.

In the letter addressed to the JAC Chairperson, JPA has demanded cancellation of all board exams for the time being. "Parents are concerned about the wellbeing of their children as they would have to travel to exam centres and appear for the papers amid growing cases of Covid infection. The JAC exams, set to begin on May 4, should be cancelled for the time being," the letter stated.

The developments come at a time when the Covid-19 situation in the state is turning bad to worse. In the past 48 hours, Jharkhand has reported around 6000 Covid cases and 60 Covid deaths, reveals government data. The state is also battling a crisis of drugs and hospital beds after the sudden spike in the active caseload. The JAC already started the practical exams for class 10 and 12 on April 6.



The president of JPA, Ajay Rai said that it would be unfair on ICSE and JAC students if they are asked to appear for their board exams at a time when the CBSE has cancelled its class 10 exams and postponed class 12 exams.

"The rules should be the same for all students irrespective of their board. We cannot ask ICSE and JAC students to appear for exams at a time when CBSE has made changes in the exam schedule owing to the Covid-19 crisis," said Rai, adding that safety of students should be paramount for any board and the parents' association in Jharkhand will press for postponement of exams.

Around 7 lakh students are set to appear in the class 10 and class 12 board exams to be conducted by JAC from May 4. The exams, as per the existing schedule, will be held at over 2000 centres across the 24 districts in Jharkhand.

India foiled Chinese bid to change status quo at LAC: CDS Rawat

Despite China adopting "shove and push" tactics, India foiled these bids and prevented a change in status quo at the Line of Actual Control (LAC), Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) General Bipin Rawat said here on Thursday.

Making this assertion in his lecture at the Raisina Dialogue, he also said the country proved it will not get pushed under any pressure in apparent reference to the nearly ten-month long stand-offs in Eastern Ladakh. He also said China is using its military might and conveying the message it is "my way or no way."

Rawat said China felt that it will be able to compel nations to give in to its demands by doing a little bit of "shove and push" as it has superior armed forces because of technological advantage.

"But, I think India stood firm on the northern borders and we have proven that we will not get pushed," he said at the virtual conference.

He said India was able to get support of the international community by standing firm in preventing the attempt of changing the status quo in the region.

"They tried to ensure that they can change the status quo by the use of disruptive technologies without using force... They thought that India, as a nation, will succumb to the pressures that they have been putting on us because of the technological advantage that they have," he said, adding

that did not happen.

The CDS said the international community came to India's support to say that "yes there is an international base-line rule order which every nation must follow. That is what we have been able to achieve."

His remarks came in the backdrop of face-offs at several friction points in Eastern Ladakh since May last year. The tension mounted after a violent brawl in June in the Galwan valley between the troops of India and China leaving 20 Indian soldiers including the commanding officer dead. More than 40 Chinese soldiers were also killed but China is yet to officially make public the number of casualties.

As a result of a series of military and diplomatic talks, India and China completed withdrawal of troops and weapons from the North and South banks of Pangong lake in February. The two sides are now engaged in talks to extend the disengagement process to the remaining friction points.

Rawat said "They feel that they have arrived and they have a superior armed force because of the technological advantage that they have," He also said "They have been able to create disruptive technologies which

can paralyse systems of the adversary, and therefore, they feel that just by doing a little bit of shove and push, they will be able to compel nations to give in to their demands."

Referring to modernisation of the armed forces, the CDS described the F-35 fighter jets of the US as a state of the art platform but added that he was not sure whether the US will share the technology with India.

"What they have offered us is a lower version in the F-series," he said.

At the conference, Chief of Staff, Joint Staff of Japan Self Defence Forces, General Koji Yamazaki said China is attempting to unilaterally change the international order, and that it is necessary for cooperation among like-minded countries in areas of disruptive technologies and counter the "grey zone tactics".

He said China does not recognise the legitimate interests of Japan and other countries in the region and such an approach will heighten tension, adding rules-based order is necessary for stability in the Indo-Pacific region. Yamazaki also noted that any probable contingency in Taiwan directly impacts the defence of Japan.

Chief of Defence Force of Australia General Angus Campbell said the "grey zone tactics" are a way to nibble away at territory. "We see this in the South China Sea. It is very challenging to respond without

Indo-Pacific epicentre of strategic contest: Oz PM

With China flexing its muscle in the Indo-Pacific region and objecting to the Quad nations presence there, Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison said here on Thursday the region has become the epicentre of strategic competition.

Making this observation in the ongoing Raisina Dialogue here, he said in this backdrop like-minded nations need to act more consistently and cohesively to protect their shared interests in the face of multiple challenges.

His remarks came as the Quad nations including India, US, Japan and Australia some months back conducted the Malabar series of naval exercises off the Indian coast. China has objected to it saying the Quad will lead to militarisation of the Indo-Pacific region.

Without mentioning any country, the Australian Prime Minister also referred to the growing tensions over territorial

claims and the unprecedented pace of military modernisation in the region.

"Democratic sovereign nations are being threatened and coerced by foreign interference. Cyber attacks are becoming more sophisticated, including from State-sponsored actors," he said at the virtual conference.

"Economic coercion is being employed as a tool of statecraft. Liberal rules and norms are under assault and there is a great polarisation that our world is at risk of moving towards," Morrison said.

He said a polarisation is taking place between authoritarian regimes and liberal democracies, adding that a liberal democracy and a liberal set of values underpin the global order that has delivered so much to the world.

He said like-minded nations need to act more consistently and cohesively in protecting their shared interests. "The Indo-Pacific is the region that will shape our prosperity, our security and our destiny, individually and collectively," Morrison said. "The Indo-Pacific is the epicentre of strategic competition," he added.

Morrison also said the corona pandemic has provided a fresh perspective in creating new opportunities to build a durable strategic balance in the Indo-Pacific region.

Incidentally, on Wednesday Indian Navy Chief Admiral Karambir Singh underlined the high level of synergy amongst the navies of the Quadilateral countries and said these forces can come together in a plug and play mechanism in case of a military need in the Indo-Pacific region.

Participating in the Dialogue inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday, Admiral Philip Scot Davidson, Commander of the

US Indo-Pacific Command, identified the Quad as a strategic opportunity diplomatically, military and economically, as he designated China as "the greatest strategic threat" to rules-based international order.

The two Navy top commanders during the conclave held virtually discussed the potential of the Quad and agreed that there are many new spheres of engagement where the grouping can come together and also include more like-minded countries.

Asked about the future of Quad military in terms of joint patrolling and others, the Indian Navy chief said the Quad started as a consultative grouping and has evolved and grown organically. "There is no dearth of issues that it can handle and we have a robust engagement with the navies of all Quad members," he said.

The Navy chief said the Quad navies already enjoy high degree of interoperability and highlighted that the Malabar exercise started with the US in 1992.

Similarly, he pointed out that India has been carrying bilateral naval exercises with Japan since 2012 and with the Australian Navy for the last six years. "So if an opportunity arises, we have the capability and capacity to come together in almost a plug and play mechanism," he said.

The US Navy commander said the Quad has tremendous potential for cooperation, going far beyond the security sphere. "The vaccine approach is a powerful signal to the region that the Quad is working for the common good outside these four countries," he said.

Noting that the Quad has gained momentum, Davidson said, "It's a diamond of democracies in region... We should think about it in broadest possible terms."

He also said China seeks to exploit the current global pandemic with increased military aggression throughout the Indo-Pacific. He added that China's intent is to undermine international law and norms.

Make plans to counter future challenges, IAF told

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Thursday urged the IAF to draw long-term plans to counter any threat and appreciated the role of the Service in prompt, timely and befitting response during the stand-off at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Eastern Ladakh.

Making this observation while inaugurating the first bi-annual IAF Commanders' Conference of the year here, Rajnath asked the IAF brass to fashion strategies for capability enhancement to counter future threats. He appreciated the critical focus of IAF towards reorienting for the future.

Speaking about the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, the Minister appreciated the role played by the IAF in assisting other Government agencies in



their task.

Referring to changing international geopolitics, he observed that the perceptible shift of focus from Trans-Atlantic to Trans-Pacific has become more obvious in the recent past.

Changing dimensions of war would now include advanced technologies, asymmetric capabilities and information dominance, and it was very important that the IAF's

preparations for the future must include these aspects, he said.

Reiterating Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of 'Self Reliance', Rajnath stressed on the need to promote Atmanirbharta in defence infrastructure.

He added the IAF's order for Tejas Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) would result in a substantial boost to the domestic defence industry and



will be a game changer from the indigenisation perspective. The order for the LCA to be manufactured by the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) is more than Rs 50,000 crores for 100 jets.

He urged the Commanders to continue their efforts for achieving even greater results in the field of indigenous defence production and aircraft maintenance.

He added that national security and economic development are complementary aspects of national policy.

Rajnath stressed on the need to continue to work proactively towards the integration process currently underway, implementation of the joint logistics plan and to enhance synergy in areas of joint planning and operations.

He assured the Commanders of the wholehearted support from the Ministry of Defence in achieving the goal of being a potent Strategic Aerospace Force. The Commanders' Conference will conclude on April 16.

The status of strengthening current combat capabilities and the action plan for making IAF a future-ready combat force would be examined. Issues pertaining to systems, reforms and restructuring for ensuring more efficient processes across all domains and optimised operational training will also be discussed.

SC asks CBI to conduct further probe into role of erring cops in ISRO espionage case

The Supreme Court Thursday ordered that the report of a high-level committee on the role of erring police officials in 1994 espionage case relating to ISRO scientist Nambi Narayanan be given to the CBI and directed the agency to conduct further investigation on the issue.

The apex court said the CBI may treat the panel's findings as part of preliminary investigation and asked the agency to submit its report to the court within three months.

A bench headed by Justice A M Khanwilkar said the report of the three-member panel, headed by former top court judge Justice (retired) D K Jain, be kept in a sealed cover and it should not be published.

The top court rejected the submission of former DGP Siby Mathews, who was then heading the SIT probe team, that he was not heard by the committee while Narayanan was heard.

The bench, also comprising Justices Dinesh Maheshwari and Krishna Murari, said the committee was not to adjudicate the matter but it had to go through circumstantial evidence and form a prima facie view on the acts of omission and commission of erring officials.

The apex court was hearing the Centre's plea seeking con-

sideration of the report filed by the committee regarding the role of erring police officials in espionage case relating to Narayanan, who had been acquitted and was eventually awarded Rs 50 lakh compensation by the top court.

On April 5, the Centre had moved the top court seeking urgent hearing and consideration of the panel's report terming it as a "national issue".

The apex court had appointed the panel on September 14, 2018 while directing the Kerala government to cough up Rs 50 lakh compensation for compelling Narayanan to undergo "immense humiliation".

It had ordered setting up of the committee to take appropriate steps against the erring officials for causing "tremendous harassment" and "immeasurable anguish" to Narayanan and had directed the Centre and state government to nominate one officer each in the panel.

Terming the police action against the ex-scientist of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) as a "psycho-pathological treatment", the apex court had in September 2018 said that his "liberty and dignity", basic to his human rights, were jeopardised as he was taken into custody and, eventually, despite all the glory of the past, was compelled to face "cynical abhorrence".

Govt relaxes rules for renewal of OCI cards

The Centre on Thursday eased out many conditions related to the re-issue of OCI (Overseas Citizen of India) cards. Union Home Ministry relaxed the mandatory renewal of OCI card along with the issue of new passport renewal of other countries. The government also relaxed norms of renewal of OCI card to a person who attained the age of 20 years also.

Presently, the OCI card is required to be re-issued each time a new passport is issued up to 20 years of age and once after completing 50 years of age, in view of biological changes in the face of the applicant. With a view to facilitating the OCI cardholders, it has now been decided by the Government of India to dispense with this requirement.

A person who has got registration as an OCI cardholder prior to attaining the age of 20 years will have to get the OCI card re-issued only once when a new passport is issued after his/her completing 20 years of age, so as to capture his/ her facial features on attaining adulthood. If a person has obtained registration as an OCI cardholder after attaining the age of 20 years, there will be no requirement of re-issue of an OCI card.

Exposure to higher levels of air pollution likely to increase severity of Covid

Exposure to higher levels of air pollution is likely to increase the severity of Covid-19 among people suffering from respiratory conditions such as asthma or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), a study has warned.

Researchers from the University of Cincinnati in the US found that a one-unit increase in particulate matter 2.5 was associated with a 60 per cent higher chance of hospitalisation for Covid-19 patients with pre-existing respiratory disease.

Particulate matter less or equal to 2.5 micrometers refers to a mixture of tiny particles and droplets in the air that are two-and-one half microns or less in width.

For patients without respiratory disease, no association was observed, revealed the findings published online in the scholarly journal Respiratory Medicine.

"Particulate matter is very small, small enough to be inhaled deep into the lungs, they cross into the blood and also affect other organ systems. Air pollution as a result of emissions from automobiles, factories or other sources is a generator of particulate matter," Angelico Mendy, MD, Assistant Professor of environmental and public health sciences, at the varsity's College of Medicine.

Some allegations against judges are shockingly false, says SC

The Supreme Court on Thursday said some of the allegations made against judges are so "shockingly false" that if there had been no security of tenure, they could have been easily "knocked out".

The top court favoured fixed tenure of two or more years for ad-hoc judges if they are appointed in high courts to reduce the backlog of pending cases.

A special bench headed by Chief Justice S A Bobde said, "Position of judge has to be made secure. I tell you, we have seen allegations against judges which are shockingly false. Yes, some of them are shockingly false. You can easily knock out a judge if there is no security. There has to be security of tenure for ad-hoc judges".

A bench, also comprising Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul and Surya Kant, which was hearing arguments on the modalities of appointments of ad-hoc judges, reserved verdict on a plea filed by NGO Lok Prahari seeking appointment of additional judges in the high courts under Article 224A of the Constitution in order to reduce the pendency of cases.

Article 224-A of Constitution says that "the Chief Justice of a High Court



for any State may at any time, with the previous consent of the President, request any person who has held the office of a Judge of that Court or of any other High Court to sit and act as a Judge of the High Court for that State".

Justice Kaul said he concurs with the views of the CJI as every time a judge is appointed, frivolous complaints are made and the court cannot put the entire system of appointment of ad-hoc judges in question.

"Ad-hoc judges cannot be made vulnerable," the bench said, adding that too much fine-tuning may lead to losing the objective behind the appointment process.

The top court also rejected the submission of senior advocate Vikas Singh and

some of other lawyers appearing in the matter that many of the former judges may not be interested in taking the job as they may be more interested in other lucrative fields like arbitration.

"We think this decision should be left to the former judges. We cannot decide for them. The chief justice will definitely discuss with the retired judge which is proposed to be appointed as ad-hoc judge. If the retired judge thinks that he has something better to do, then he can very well say no to the appointment," the bench said.

The CJI also brushed aside the argument that high court chief justices may not be able to hear important matters, if ad-hoc judges are appointed.

NGT prepones 2021 summer vacation due to exponential surge in Covid-19

The National Green Tribunal on Thursday preponed its summer vacation for 2021 in the light of exponential surge in Covid-19 cases.

An office order issued by the NGT authorities said that the earlier notified summer vacation from June 1, 2021, to June 30, 2021 stands cancelled and shall be working for the tribunal.

In lieu of the same, the period from April 19, 2021, to May 18, 2021 (both days inclusive) shall be observed as summer vacation for all the benches, it said.

"In the light of the sudden and exponential surge in COVID-19 cases, the competent authority has pleased to modify the calendar with respect to summer vacations to be observed by all the benches of the National Green Tribunal.

India, France sign agreement for cooperation on Gaganyaan mission

Space agencies of India and France on Thursday signed an agreement for cooperation for the former's first human space mission, Gaganyaan, a move that will enable Indian flight physicians to train at French facilities.

French space agency CNES said under the agreement, equipment developed by it, tested and still operating aboard the International Space Station (ISS) will be made available to Indian crews.

The CNES will also be supplying fireproof carry bags made in France to shield equipment from shocks and radiation, it said.

The agreement was announced during French Foreign Affairs Minister Jean-Yves Le Drian's visit to the Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) headquarters in Bengaluru.

Centre urged to restart distribution of free food grains

Following the second wave of Covid-19, a few State Governments including Rajasthan, Kerala and Uttarakhand as well as MPs from NCP, TMC, CPI and CPI-M have urged the Centre to restart distribution of free food grains to 810 million poor people under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana (PMGKAY), which was launched last year during the first wave of the pandemic. Under the scheme, the Centre distributed 5 kg rice or wheat per person and one kg of pulses per family covered under the National Food Security Act from April-November 2020.

With various States imposing partial lockdowns and curfews due to a sharp rise in cases in the second wave of the pandemic, the need for providing food security to the poor is being felt again by some State Governments.

Ample stock of oxygen available in country to tackle Covid: Centre

Amid growing demands for medical oxygen in the country, the Centre on Thursday assured that sufficient stocks of oxygen are available in the country even as it has started the mapping of sources for supply of medical oxygen to the affected States to ensure its uninterrupted supply.

The States with greater needs of oxygen are Maharashtra, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, and Chhattisgarh. Besides, there is more consumption of medical oxygen in Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Punjab, and Rajasthan.

The Union Health Ministry said that the present oxygen stocks are more than 50 thousand metric tonnes in the country. In a statement here, it said that the country's daily

production capacity of oxygen is more than seven thousand metric tonnes and the production capacity has further scaled up.

The Central Government has asked the States to make rational use of medical oxygen and avoid wastage to fulfill the growing demands.

An Empowered Group in this regard has also initiated action to ensure the sufficient availability of medical oxygen. The Government assured that the surplus oxygen available with the steel plants is also being utilised as per the need. States have also been asked to set up Control Rooms to ensure a smooth supply of oxygen to the districts.

The Government has initiated several measures to ensure the supply of medical oxygen to various affected States.

TMC men urinate in BJP leader’s mouth: Sources

With reports of electoral violence breaking records with each passing phase the latest one came from East Midnapore where alleged Trinamool Congress cadres urinated in the mouth of a block BJP leader Shyamsundar Das, BJP sources said adding the victim was beaten up too.

Das has been hospitalised at Mecheda town, sources in the saffron party said. The TMC however denied the involvement of its party men. Elsewhere at violence-torn Nanoor constituency in Birbhum district local Trinamool leader Nurman Sheikh on Wednesday evening openly threatened CPI(M) candidate Shyamali Pradhan with chopping of the hands of Left voters. Pradhan is a sitting MLA too.

Nurman accosted Pradhan at Agartar village in Agartar village in Nanoor constituency when she went their campaigning. “Why have come here... you cannot campaign here ... there is no CPI(M) here ... we will not allow them (Left voters) to go and vote ... and if they do their hands will be chopped off,” he was heard telling

the Left candidate.

Incidentally barely a day before a similar threat came from Birbhum TMC president Anubrata Mondal who referred to earlier incidents of violence and murder saying “you are trying to stop me but there is no point doing so ... murders had taken place in 2011, 2014, 2019 ... murders will take place this time also.”

He was referring to a showcase notice issued to him by the Election Commission to explain his conduct regarding an earlier threat issued to BJP saying “they will be beaten away from this area.”

Meanwhile, hours after coming out of a 48-hour ban from campaigning for using violent languages BJP candidate from Bongaon Rahul Sinha seemed to return to his elements on Thursday referring once again to the Cooch Behar police firing and threatening there will be more such firing to ensure peaceful voting.

Quoting Police Observer Vivek Dubey he said, “I will once again say that the central forces should resort to firing if there anyone tries to capture booths ... in the firing death is not a big question ... the point is you have to ensure free and fair election.

Political differences make friends foes in Bengal

Jehanara Khatoon and Alpana Biswas are two great friends. Their husbands are not. While Jehenara’s husband Kamran is a committed Trinamool Congress worker, Biswas’ husband Aroop is a “comrade-turned-pracharak.”

Such is the intensity of their hatred that one suspects that Kamran had a hand in Biswas’ tank being poisoned last December killing fishes worth about a lakh of rupees. All for political rivalry.

Whereas till a few years ago the two families had great dealings. “Both belonged to the Left and both were happy... After Mamata Banerjee came to power her men bought over the minority people here with posts and other facilities ... Kamran joined the TMC.

As the rivalry began the organizational base of CPI(M) shrank “not because we were disliked by the people but because they would not allow us to work politically ... if you join a rally they will fine you often in lakhs ... insult your sis-

ter ... or even kill you ... gradually the Left workers were immobilized as the TMC had a field day ...”Still we gave a fight in 2013 panchayat elections and even 2016 Assembly polls ... but they would not let our men vote ... we would sit back home and they would cast our votes ... as the CPI(M) faded the vacuum that was filled by the BJP which came with leaders like Dilip Ghosh who prescribed eye-for-an-eye ... that the people lapped up and the whole village became BJP,” Biswas a member of the Matua community says, adding the TMC has filled the area with corruption, cut money and crime.

Curiously “both the TMC and the BJP are vying for Matua votes but when it comes to the ground level minorities are preferred to the Matuas because they vote in block,” says Swapan Bhowmick a social worker adding how “communalization of Bengal has taken place in the past 5-10 years.”

At Hatishala village Naresh Mandal a local says, “For my sister’s marriage I had to take loan of Rs 2 lakh from a bank at Bagula

(a nearby panchayat). The local TMC leader managed it for me and took a whopping Rs 75,000 out of that.”

Iphshita a school teacher from Mayurhat says how she had to shell out Rs 5 lakh for the job adding her sister a nurse had to give Rs 2 lakh for a temporary job at a hospital at Ranaghat.

Abdul Karim a local from Majdia says he has job card but is seldom given work in the 100-days work scheme. “If they get me to sign there for 50 days, they will give me payment for 10 days ... rest will be appropriated by their men,” he says. And what if he takes it up with the BDO. “Babu then you will not be there to be seen the next day... even the BDO Saheb does not have a say... they have the power to make him do sit-ups in public.”

Anima a 75-year-old widow from Shahpur says how she had to give Rs 10,000 for a room and a bathroom to be made under Indira Awas scheme. “When I refused to give that money they stopped my widow allowance ... on the one hand they had to show the list of constructed houses on

the other hand they needed cash and there they took that from helpless people like us ...” asked,” says she adding she has not voted since 2011. “My husband was a CPI(M) voter and so was I. But after 2011 we could not vote because they would not let us vote,” she says adding “who wants to get hurt ... if I die it is good but if I get a fractured leg then who will look after me ... I have nobody.” The helplessness is writ large on her face.

At Hatishala and Ghosh Para there are numerous such families that have shifted allegiance from the Red to BJP. “I am a born Leftist within, I joined the Brigade (Parade Ground) rally in Kolkata but I am working for the BJP locally because CPI(M) cannot handle the TMC’s money and muscle power ... the BJP match- es them in every respect ... besides they are in power in the Centre and can put their big leaders in jail for numerous scams if they cross their limits which the CPI(M) cannot do,” says Tapash Ghosh from Ghosh Para in Ranaghat North-East constituency.

Kerala takes fresh measures to control Covid

With the Centre terming Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan as a COVIDIOT because of his alleged violation of pandemic protocols and the number of new persons tested positive for Covid-19 nearing 8,300 on Thursday, the State administration tightened the rules to prevent further spreading of the disease.

Earlier in the day the Union Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs and External Affairs said Vijayan should be addressed as COVID-IOT because of his reckless behaviour on the day of polling (April 6) and in the subsequent days when he threw to the winds all norms specified by medical experts.

Vijayan had been admitted to the Medical College Hospital from where he was discharged on Wednesday. He is back in his palatial residence at Pinarayi where he would be recuperating for the next ten days.

The Chief Minister reportedly held a virtual meeting with other ministers and bureaucrats on Thursday where it was decided to take drastic steps to prevent the spread of the pandemic but without causing any inconvenience to the general public.

A Government Order issued after the meeting said that crowding during public and private functions would be brought under strict control. Marriages, house warming func-

tions and other private ceremonies should be intimated to the local authorities well in advance, said the order.

Addressing the media later in the day, V P Joy, chief secretary, said all front line workers and people above the age of 45 would be checked on Friday and Saturday as part of the massive testing ordered for the next two days,

He said there was no shortage of vaccines in the State as alleged by certain people. “We have stock of more than 7 lakh doses of vaccines and the Centre has assured us that we will be given more than two lakh doses in the nest two days,” said the Chief Secretary.

He ruled out the possibilities of total lock down and pointed out that malls and hotels have been instructed to down the shutters by 9 pm.

Joy also disclosed that there were 1.15 crore persons in the State who are of in the age group of 45 and above. “We will vaccinate this entire category of people and also vaccinate those below the age of 45. It has been found that persons below the age of 45 are the main carriers of the pandemic,” he said.

The chief secretary said that the top priority of the Government was to hold the public examinations for students and he requested the general public to postpone unimportant meetings and gatherings to later dates considering the gravity of the situation.

Govt only indulging in sham of Covid ‘vaccine festival’: RaGa

New Delhi: Former Congress chief Rahul Gandhi on Thursday attacked the Government over the handling of the Covid-19 situation and alleged that it is only indulging in a "sham" of a 'vaccine festival'. He also alleged that there is no testing, no beds in hospitals, neither ventilators nor oxygen and vaccine is also not available. His sister and party's general secretary Priyanka Gandhi asked the Uttar Pradesh government to take concrete steps to prevent the spread of coronavirus and asserted that it is "futile" to invest time and resources in "hiding" this tragedy.

Rahul Gandhi also took a jibe asking what PM-CARES is doing, as huge donations were given to the fund for handling COVID-19 situation. "There are no tests or beds in hospitals. There are no ventilators or oxygen. The vaccine is also not there. But there is a sham of a

festival. PM-CARES?" he asked. His attack came after the government celebrated the 'Tika Utsav' (vaccine festival) from April 11 to 14.

Taking to Twitter, Priyanka tagged a video purportedly showing Baikunth Dham crematorium in Lucknow being covered by opaque screens. "There is a request to the government of Uttar Pradesh: It is futile to invest time, resources and energy into hiding, suppressing this tragedy," Priyanka Gandhi said in a tweet in Hindi.

"Take concrete steps to stop the pandemic, save lives, and prevent the spread of infection. This is the need of the hour," she said. The Congress leader had on Wednesday accused the Uttar Pradesh government of hiding coronavirus numbers and said had they been cautious from day one, people would not have witnessed such times. **PNS**

Alarmed by Covid surge, J&K admin defers summer Darbar

Jammu: Taking note of the alarming surge in Covid-19 cases, the Union Territory Government on Thursday decided to defer the summer Darbar move 2021 and reinforce its resources towards the containment of the pandemic.

It was also decided that the civil secretariat will continue to function through its e-office in both the capital cities of Jammu and Srinagar so that the public at large is not inconvenienced at either capital.

As part of the biannual darbar move and the civil secretariat's shift, other move offices and the Raj Bhavan were scheduled to close in Jammu on April 30 to May 1 and set to begin functioning in the summer capital from May 10.

Last year also the government had delayed the shifting of Darbar move offices to Srinagar till June 15 in the wake

of Covid-19 pandemic.

The functioning of the dual-secretariat will ensure uninterrupted functioning of the UT administration while reducing the need for long-distance travel of the public.

During a high-level meeting chaired by LG Manoj Sinha it was observed that a complete shift of Darbar offices to Srinagar from 30th April can jeopardize COVID-control efforts in Jammu and Kashmir. As elsewhere in the country, the number of COVID cases in the Union territory is at an all-time high and requires uninterrupted attention for effective monitoring and control.

The Government also directed the Administrative Secretaries to put in place a robust mechanism for holding virtual offices through e-office and use online/electronic/video conferencing/other modes of communication at the two cap-

ital cities.

J&K Secretariat has already switched over to a paperless office by rolling out the prestigious e-office project. As such, most of the official record is available on the web cloud which can be easily accessed and retrieved by the authenticated employees' accounts anywhere, anytime.

It was also decided that GAD will issue orders regarding 'move' HoDs, all of whom will also need to shift to e-office. This will apply to all HoDs, barring a few.

Meanwhile, the UT government also decided to postpone the class XII J&k board exams till further orders and cancelled ongoing class X exams.

The Union Territory recorded 1141 fresh cases of coronavirus with Jammu division accounting for 434 and Kashmir 707 cases. **PNS**

Covid-19 surge: ASI monuments closed for visitors till May 15



New Delhi: All centrally protected monuments, museums and sites under the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) have been closed with immediate effect till May 15 due to the surge in coronavirus cases in the country, the Union culture ministry said on Thursday.An order to this effect was issued by the ASI and it was tweeted by Culture Minister Prahlad Patel this evening. "Due to the prevailing COVID situation, it has been decided to close all centrally protected monuments, sites and museums under the ASI with immediate effect and till May 15 or until further orders," the ASI said. These include 3,693 monuments and 50 museums. In live monuments like Puri Jagannath Temple and

Somnath Temple, daily 'puja' will be conducted but no public gathering will be allowed, said Nitin Tripathi, the ministry's media advisor.

Last year, too, all monuments and sites maintained by the ASI were closed due to the coronavirus pandemic on March 17. They reopened in July with strict restrictions like mandatory wearing of masks, cap on the number of visitors and social distancing. The curbs were relaxed later in the year. India's daily COVID-19 cases surged to a record high of 2,00,739 on Thursday, taking the country's cumulative tally to 1,40,74,564, according to Union health ministry data. The death toll climbed to 1,73,123 with 1,038 new fatalities, the highest since October 3, the data stated. **PTI**

NIA organises BRICS seminar on ‘misuse of internet by terrorists’

New Delhi: The immense challenges posed by the misuse of the internet by terrorists can be effectively tackled by international cooperation and sharing of good practices, delegates underscored at a BRICS seminar hosted by India.

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) organised the two-day online event here of the BRICS nations that includes Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa on April 13-14.

The seminar on the theme 'Misuse of Internet for Terrorist Purposes and Role of Digital Forensics in Terrorist Investigations' was inaugurated by Union Home Secretary Ajay Bhalla on Tuesday. The NIA organised the seminar as India is holding the BRICS chair for the year 2021.

"The delegates at the seminar appreciated the fact that in the current milieu of breakneck technological innovations and ever-evolving digital landscape, the challenges pertaining to prevention, control and prosecution of the terrorist misuse of Internet are immense," the NIA said in a statement.

"It was emphasised that it is only through expedient international cooperation and seamless sharing of good practices in tackling this menace that we can create a safer and secure environment for citizens of

BRICS member states as well as the whole world," it said.

A number of technical sessions were held during the seminar like 'exploitation of social media as an arsenal', 'dark web and anonymisers', 'emerging technologies and artificial intelligence', 'crypto currency and virtual assets: vulnerability of privacy and online stealth', equipping law enforcement agencies: counter-terrorist investigations and digital forensics. In the seminar, as many as 40 experts from the five member countries deliberated upon these technical sessions.

Two panel discussions on engaging multiple stakeholders from both public and private sectors to tackle the misuse of the Internet and enhancing international cooperation to effectively tackle the exploitation of the Internet by terrorists for their nefarious activities were also held, the statement said.

BRICS member states in 3rd Counter Terrorism Working Group (CTWG) at White River, South Africa had agreed to establish five sub working groups dedicated to enhance debates over specific challenges on counter-terrorism front. Thereafter, at the 4th CTWG meeting at Brasilia, India was given the Presidency of the sub-working group on "Misuse of Internet for Terrorist Purposes" for one year, it added. **PNS**

BMC debunks perception that it purchased Remdesivir vials ‘at very high rates’

Amid news reports that it purchased Remdesivir injections at rates 2.5 times more than their actual cost, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) on Thursday debunked the "perception" sought to be created by a section of the media that it had purchased Remdesivir vials “at very high rates”, by saying that it “is not correct at all”.

“There is a perception created by a section of the media that the BMC has purchased Injection Remdesivir at very high rates which is not correct at all. We reiterate that BMC shall always strive to give the best services to Mumbaikars. Team Media must support BMC in these extremely critical times to decisively and effectively defeat the Covid pandemic,” the BMC said in a statement issued here.

Explaining the circumstances leading to BMC purchasing 2,00,000 at Rs 1,568 per vial Remdesivir injections, the BMC said: There is an acute shortage of Remdesivir vaccine in the entire country. On 1st April 2021 Haffkine Bio-Pharmaceutical Corporation Ltd. paced orders for 57,100 vials of Remdesivir at the rate of Rs. 665/- per vial. However, it is a fact that till today the said order has not been entertained by the supplier”.

On April 5, the BMC floated a bid for purchase of 2,00,000 vials of

Remdesivir which was due on April 7. Only one bid was received from Mylan till April 7 at 4.00 pm. The BMC’s stock position on April 7 happened to be 10,471 vials which would have been sufficient for 3 to 4 days only.

“On April 7 morning BMC spoke to Cipla and explored the possibilities of getting supplies of around 10,000 vials. However, Cipla expressed its inability to supply any vial immediately. Due to supply constraints, no other company showed interest in this bid,” the statement said

“The only bidder, namely Mylan refused to reduce the bid price of Rs. 1,568/- inclusive of GST. The scarcity is not only in Maharashtra but all over the country. It was vital to make available Remdesivir to critical patients in MCGM without fail. As seen from different media reports on April 7 various States and cities were trying to procure Remdesivir to protect their citizens,” the statement said.

“It was imperative to act fast and decisively to procure Remdesivir on April 7 or BMC would have faced a huge crisis to treat patients. Any delay would have resulted in Remdesivir going out to other cities/States of India in this scarcity time bringing bad name to BMC specially when Mumbai is the financial capital of India. Between money and human lives, BMC opted to save all

possible human lives even if it meant spending an extra amount of money for securing 2,00,000 vials of Remdesivir,” the BMC said.

On April 7, more than 17,431 beds were occupied by covid patients under MCGM. Therefore, BMC had to bite the bullet and order was placed on April 7 2021 itself to procure 2,00,000 Remdesivir out of which 25,000 vials were received immediately,” the BMC said. “In sharp contrast to this prompt delivery of Remdesivir vaccine to BMC by the vendor, Haffkine Bio-Pharmaceutical Corporation Ltd’s order of 57,100 vials of Remdesivir at the rate of Rs.665/-, is still not entertained with no supplies made till date,” the BMC said.

The BMC also said that around the time it placed an order on Mylan for purchase of Remdesivir injections, organisations like the Surat Municipal Corporation, District Hospital, Satara, Commissioner of Medical Education, MP, Mission Director, NHM, Assam, Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMC) and Gujarat Medical Services Corporations Limited placed similar orders on Mylan.

“BMC has taken the lead in placing the order at the earliest keeping in view the interest of Mumbaikars and at prices comparable with various other cities of India,” the civic body said in its statement

BMC converts Mumbai’s Jaslok hospital into dedicated Covid-19 hospital

In a view of the alarming surge in the Covid-19 cases and high occupancy of patients in the Dedicated Covid Hospitals (DCHs), the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) on Thursday converted Mumbai’s famed Jaslok Hospital in south Mumbai into a dedicated Covid-19 hospital.

Announcing this here, Mumbai Municipal Commissioner I S Chahal said: “Additional 250 Covid beds in JASLOK Hospital will come on BMC’s online dashboard by Saturday morning to help needy patients. Of the 250 beds, 40 will be ICU beds”.

In two more major announcements aimed at increasing Covid-19 beds across the metropolis, the Mumbai civic chief said that

1500 additional beds (mostly oxygenated) will be added to NESCO Jumbo Covid-19 facility in seven days, while 30 more ICU beds were being added to Seven Hills Hospital At Andheri (East) in north Mumbai on Thursday.

“Given that the current surge in the pandemic cases and high occupancy of beds in DCHs – especially in private hospitals is very high, it is necessary to increase the number of beds with advance critical care in Mumbai,” Chahal said.

“Jaslok has served as a DCH hospital with advanced critical care since the beginning of the pandemic and has been treating the Covid019 excellently. In view of the current need, we have decided to convert the Jaslok Hospital into a dedicated Covid-19 hospital. It will no longer admit non-

Covid patients,” the Mumbai civic chief said.

Following its decision to convert Jaslok Hospital into a dedicated Covid hospital, the BMC has instructed the hospital management to discharge all the existing “stable” undergoing treatment in speciality wards, to shift all such patients requiring non-Covid tertiary care to nearby tertiary hospitals in 48 hours and to discharge all patients admitted for elective treatments by postponing their surgeries.

The BMC has also asked the Jaslok Hospital management to augment suspected/holding area for suspected Covid-19 cases, if required and follow all protocols and guidelines laid down for dedicated Covid hospitals as earlier.

Located on upmarket Peddar Road in south Mumbai, Jaslok Hospital and Research

Centre – better known as Joslok Hospital – is private hospital founded by founded by philanthropist Seth Lokoomal

Chanrai along with surgeon Shantilal Jamnadas Mehta.

Set up in 1973, Jaslok Hospital shot to fame in late

1970s when Jayaprakash Narayan was admitted for treatment of kidney failure by the nephrologist M. K. Mani

BMC TO SET UP ‘STEP-DOWN’ FACILITIES IN 4-5 STAR HOTELS TO ACCOMMODATE PATIENTS WHO NEED MINIMAL MEDICAL INTERVENTION

Mumbai: In its effort to make available Covid-19 beds to patients without much of a time lag, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) and major hospitals in the metropolis have decided to jointly identify four-star and five-star hotels in their neighbourhood to set up step-down facilities to accommodate patients who need minimal medical intervention.

Announcing the setting up of stre-down facilities at four/five-star hotels located in the vicinity of major hospitals in the metropolis, Mumbai Municipal Commissioner I S Chahal said: “We have observed that many beds in private hospitals are occupied by patients who do not require emergency medical intervention and can be effectively managed at isolation facilities such as CCC-2 or step-down facilities”.

“if such patients are shifted to a step down

facility where minimum medical intervention is required, more number of oxygenated/ICU. Ventilator beds can be made available to patients in need of such beds. These beds will help treatment on time and reduce the fatality rate,” he said.

The Mumbai civic chief said that the BMC intended to set up step-down facilities with active participation of major private hospitals, as an “integral part of these hospitals.

Among the guidelines that the BMC has issued to facilitate linkages between the major hospitals and four star/five star hotels include identification of hotels, need for a proper understanding between private hospitals and hotels, hotels should be able spare at least 20 of its rooms and that the step-down facilities shall be an extension of private hospitals

Youth found hanging from tree, family cries murder

Walk the talk

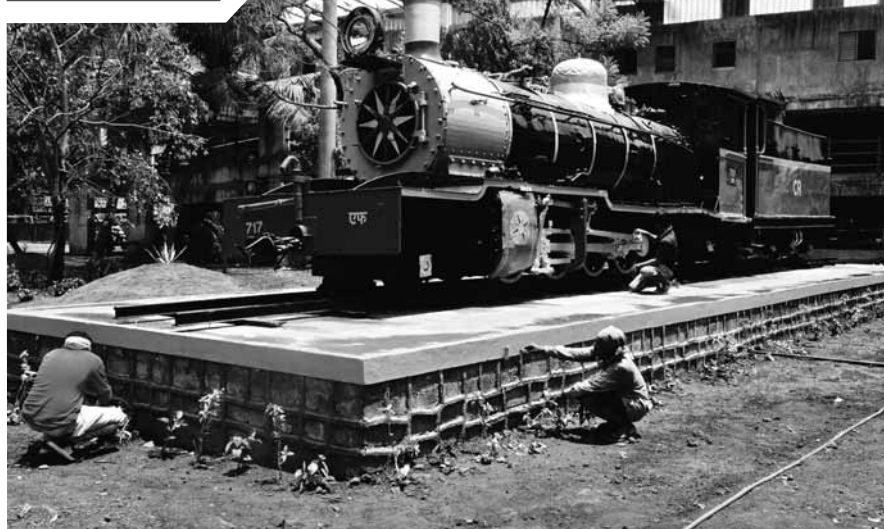
Only lip service won't do, the *netas* must follow COVID-appropriate behaviour at all times

The pandemic has upended all the notions of life, as we knew it, from personal hygiene to societal behaviour to health to economy, but the one bulwark it has failed to burst through is the way our politicians think and act. There should be no double standards in dealing with the raging contagion but unfortunately this duality is a trait quintessential to our politicians. Though the Government is fastidiously dealing with the rising COVID-19 cases, it has literally turned a blind eye to the situation in the States currently undergoing polls, where the COVID-appropriate behaviour is a disregarded casualty. During their public rallies, road shows and campaigns, almost all political leaders and their minions overlook measures like wearing masks, maintaining social distance and other protocols. For these power-hungry politicians, the vote of any individual is more important than his/her life — hence, they have scant concerns if the COVID protocols stand in the way of their votes. Despite repeated warnings by the Election Commission, the ground condition hasn't ameliorated. But there are good examples to be had from most of the politicians abroad who — discounting the likes of ousted US President Donald Trump and Brazil's strongman President Jair Bolsonaro — aren't dyed in the same wool. For instance, British Prime Minister Boris Johnson earlier this year

put off his India visit, where he was to be the chief guest at this year's Republic Day parade, because the number of COVID-19 infections in his home country shot up exponentially and he chose to stay with his constituents to alleviate their fears. Now, again, Johnson has decided to curtail his India trip later this month because of the virus situation in England.

Johnson said the rapid drop in the COVID-19 deaths in the UK was because of the three-month lockdown and not so much because of the vaccination. We don't know whether he has any empirical evidence to back his claim, but the fact remains that the condition in his country has steadily improved while India has consistently been climbing the chart of the worst-hit countries, lagging behind only the US at the number two position, for now. Our leaders, therefore, should be ashamed of facing the electorate, for whatever it is worth, rather than milling with them to garner votes. God forbid, but if they do contract the virus — as has become the lot of a host of them — they immediately quarantine themselves in the best of medical institutes and access the best of medical care, of course at the cost of the taxpayers' money. But what about the fate of the poor masses that they leave behind, afflicted? It is for several similar reasons that after almost winning the war against COVID, we are again pinned down on the mat; thanks partly to our insouciance and largely to our political leaders. All the festivals, including the celebration of democracy, can be cherished in the real sense only when the nation's people remain healthy and enjoy their basic right to life.

Matters of faith

Can devotion alone, in the absence of precautions, protect one from deadly contagions like COVID-19?

Even as lakhs of devotees throng the Kumbh Mela venue every day in Haridwar, with practically non-existent observation of the COVID-appropriate behaviour including face masks and social distancing, Uttarakhand Chief Minister Tirath Singh Rawat kicked up another controversy by saying that the Coronavirus won't infect the pilgrims. The corollary to his logic: The devotees are "our own people" (read Indians) spread over a "vast open area" and "Ma Ganga's blessings will ensure the devotees' well-being". His reasoning flies in the face of all expert warnings and empirical evidence — the authorities detected 1,701 COVID-19 cases between April 10 and 14 at the congregation. Rawat's pearls of wisdom sprang forth when some sceptics dared to compare the largest human gathering in India to the Jamaat at the Nizamuddin Markaz, which was tainted in April last year as the "hotspot" and "epicentre" of the COVID-19 cases in Delhi and across India. He said the Kumbh was different because the Tablighi event was organised in a small enclosure, with several overseas attendees and when the Markaz was held, neither was there much awareness about Corona nor were any guidelines.

Coming from a Chief Minister who had tested positive for the viral infection on March 22 before winning the battle against it in early April, it seems that some people, and unsurprisingly the politicians, have so thick a skin that they don't learn any lessons from even personal experiences. India is currently being battered by a rapidly spreading second wave of the pernicious virus and here we are, throwing all sense and caution to the winds amid a sea of humans. One shudders to think of what may happen at the Kumbh if the virus spreads like wildfire and when these lakhs of asymptomatic devotees head back to their homes all across India and unknowingly become the delivery agents of the contagion. Experts have already warned that such a large gathering in the midst of a raging pandemic can prove to be catastrophic and severely impede India's fight against the deadly disease that has claimed millions of lives globally. Yes, Mr Chief Minister, the matters of faith can't and shouldn't be ignored but can these be subservient to the right to life and the joys of good health? That really is the question.

Socio-economic divides in 2021

As a nation, we must tear down all the obstacles that impede the participation of women in the economy, even those of the mind

Along expected lines, the post-COVID economic data point to a widening of three pre-existing divides: The gender divide, increasing asymmetries between the incomes of the rich and the poor, and an increasing rural-urban digital divide. As each of these inequalities are subjects that need targeted policy interventions, the focus in this post is on the World Economic Forum's *Global Gender Report 2021*, wherein India has slipped to the 112th ranking among 153 countries.

India, home to 0.65 billion women, has widened its gender gap from 66.8 per cent a year ago to 62.5 per cent this year. The decline is seen on multiple sub-index parameters, like the labour force participation falling from 24.8 per cent to 22.3 per cent; the share of women in senior managerial positions being as low as 14.6 per cent; estimated earnings being one-fifth of men; the political empowerment index has regressed by 13 per cent where in ministerial berths for women have declined from 23.1 per cent in 2019 to 9.1 per cent.

Gender equality is a basic human right enshrined in our Constitution and its achievement has multiplier socio-economic benefits. India is committed to the timelines of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) set by the United Nations which place gender parity at the heart of bringing a gender perspective to all development initiatives. However, the COVID-triggered economic stress will defer the timelines for achieving the SDGs by 2030.

The post-pandemic policy initiatives require increased gender-specific budgeting and recovery strategies: The Modi Government's flagship schemes that positively impacted women during the first term are an outcome of closely aligning with the Gender Responsive Budgeting (GRB) norms of the 'UN Women'. The GRB is a globally followed "best practice" among nations which allocates fiscal expenditure with specific gender perspectives. Though the *Magna*



Carta of Women (1999) required that the Governments allocate at least five per cent of the GDP to address gender issues, the amount allocated towards women's welfare has stagnated in recent years. The Union Government releases the 'Gender Budgeting Statement' consisting of two parts. The first part reflects women-specific schemes in which 100 per cent allocation is only for women. The second part reflects pro-women schemes in which 30 per cent of the allocation is for women.

In the recent years, while some schemes have achieved transversal benefits like the Jan Dhan Yojana, DBT and MNREGA, specific gender-targeted schemes have made significant improvements in the socio-economic living conditions of women. However, the funds allocated for the GRB are limited to less than five per cent of the public expenditure, and shrink to about one per cent of the GDP, making it necessary to significantly increase these budgetary outlays. The NITI Aayog estimates that India will have to increase its gender-specific spend by an additional 6.2 per cent to comply with the SDG targets.

Upskilling women to

adapt to the changing nature of jobs: The job market has undergone a tectonic shift since COVID, so the nine-to-five model is no longer the future. Deloitte's research shows that economic contraction is nudging companies towards hiring experienced freelancers.

Data point to the fact that this gig work model has found a growing traction, with 78 lakh women who had earlier dropped off from work have sought to revive their careers as the WFH concept has opened the floodgates for those who hold professional degrees combined with robust work experience. Therefore, while automation will displace many jobs, it will also create 90 million flexi-jobs in the next 10 years, according to the Boston Consulting Group.

Second, as self-employment and micro-entrepreneurship is expected to grow at an annual rate of 17 per cent and projected to reach \$455 billion by 2023, State and cooperative banks must readjust their models to disburse loans at lower rates for priority sector lending to women because the data show that women have stronger saving habits and lower non-performing loans than men. As most women lack collateral and

credit history to access formal lending, we need innovative ways to build credit history.

How much has gender inequality stunted India's economic progress? The lack of equal ownership of land, access to formal credit, the unfamiliarity of women with the latest technologies, high educational dropout rates as well as inequitable household and unpaid workload distribution have impeded Indian women's economic prosperity.

Gender inequality has, therefore, translated into enormous notional capital losses for India. The economic impact of achieving optimum levels of gender equality in India is estimated to be \$700 billion of the added GDP by 2025. The IMF estimates that equal participation of women in the workforce will increase India's GDP by 27 per cent. There is clear evidence: "When women do better, economies do better. That means we must tear down all obstacles that impede the participation of women in the economy, even the subconscious obstacles of the mind."

Engineering a better future for humankind

In this age of unprecedented technological revolution, genetic engineering is fast occupying the centre stage

In this age of unprecedented technological revolution, genetic engineering is fast occupying the centre stage. Susan Hockfield, a Professor of Neuroscience at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), says that virus-powered batteries, protein-based water filters, cancer-detecting nanoparticles, mind-reading bionic limbs, computer-engineered crops, and so on, have the potential to overcome some of the greatest humanitarian, medical and environmental challenges of our time. These are going to be next generation products that have the potential to reshape our lives. For instance, the discovery of products like aquaporin to purify water for our use that functions like a parking lot that permits only cars identified with a specific transponder to enter, is nature's marvel. All these frontier technologies have inputs of genetic engineering.

Genetic engineering has come a long way since 1971, when two scientists, Berg and Jackson, created the first molecules of a recombinant DNA. Many milestones have been accomplished since then to make genetic engineering almost child's play in the hands of a molecular biologist. But gene therapy, which genetic engineering promised, has been fraught with pitfalls despite a multitude of methodologies. As a result, inherited disorders resulting from aberrations in one's genes could not be treated by replacing or correcting a faulty gene. Correcting the gene in its specific location was an issue and when this was overcome by employing viruses, our immune system would play the spoilsport apart from other issues that sprung up. Ever since the failure of the Jesse Gelsinger trial for the cure of a rare metabolic disorder called ornithine transcarbamylase deficiency syndrome, (OTCD) in 1998, gene therapy was left gasping for breath amid stringent regulations. This is where a serendipitous observation of bacteria having the ability to specifically target the DNA of viruses to inactivate the invader, provided the breakthrough to overcome many of the pitfalls of the earlier methodologies.

CRISPR and GENE editing: CRISPR technology is a simple yet powerful tool for editing genomes. It allows researchers to easily alter DNA sequences and modify gene function. Its many potential applications include correcting genetic defects, treating and preventing the spread of diseases and improving crops. The CRISPR-Cas9 can do the job easily and precisely as CRISPR is a part of the bacterial immune system and germs, too, can get sick from viruses. Bacteria fight them by chopping their DNA or RNA with CRISPR sequences and then remember them by pasting their DNA bits into their own genome, allowing to ward off any future infections. These genetic scissors, whose use for targeted modification of genomic DNA was perfected by Jennifer Doudna and Emmanuelle Charpentier, have given a new life to genetic engineering and gene therapy. Both these scientists were the recipients of the Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 2020.

The use of CRISPR-Cas9: Many diseases that were incurable through traditional means can now be treated easily, thanks to genetic engineering. There are ongoing clinical trials using

CRISPR-based approaches to treat monogenic inherited diseases such as sickle cell anemia, childhood blindness and so on. It holds the promise to treat many other diseases such as cancer, autoimmune disorders and polygenic genetic disorders in future.

Apart from medical applications, it is being used to genetically modifying crops to make them resistant to viruses, make leaner pigs, help yeast make better beer, make mosquitoes infertile and so on. It is also possible to recreate an extinct species, so a 'Jurassic Park' could actually be a reality in the future.

Research is also underway for the use of CRISPR gene editing that could make us less vulnerable to pandemics, cancer, Alzheimer's and other diseases. Mammals have a gene known as p53 that encodes the proteins that suppress the growth of cancerous tumours. Humans and most other mammals have only one copy of this gene, whereas elephants have 20 copies, and they almost never get cancer. Hence, research is ongoing to double this gene in human beings.

Up till 2020, over a dozen clinical trials were underway for a disease called acute myeloid leukemia, super-high cholesterol and baldness. The thrust of the ongoing research is to study how bacteria developed an immune response to ward off new viruses.

Coronavirus: COVID-19 jobs, like many modern vaccines, have

also gained from the advancements in genetic engineering.

Bits of the SARS-CoV2 genes have been pasted onto the adenoviral DNA backbone, some of whose own genes have been knocked off to accommodate the foreign gene. When this vaccine is delivered, the adenovirus carrying the SARS-CoV2 will enter the human cell, it will pretend that it produces the SARS-CoV2 protein but will itself be unable to replicate and make a person sick. This creates a temporary SARS-CoV2 protein factory in our bodies to prime our immune system and prepare it to tackle any infection with the real SARS-CoV2 virus.

Hopes and pitfalls: Ever since Herbert Boyer and Stanley Cohen patented the recombinant DNA technology that they developed in 1972, and Boyer co-founded Genentech, the world's first biotechnology company in 1976, genetic engineering has been the subject of intense debate beyond the scientific arena, involving lawyers, journalists, politicians and the public at large.

Since then, genetic engineering has come through the moral issue of man playing God, with a possibility to determine the fate of the evolution of all species on planet Earth. It is generally agreed that genetically engineered organisms will not be released into the environment. Many countries, including India, have put in place ethical committees at various levels

that oversee and approve research that involves the use of genetic engineering. Even routine laboratory experiments which only aim to demonstrate cloning experiments to students in biology laboratories also need mandatory approvals of the institutional ethical committees or relevant boards. Though there are already products of genetic engineering in the market like vaccines, pest-resistant crops and genetically-engineered mosquitoes, debate continues on the ethical and moral issues surrounding genetic engineering and gene therapy. Thankfully, its fruits are slowly blossoming for larger public good.

Fortunately for humankind, in 2015 at the NAPA international conference, a consensus quickly developed that it would be bad to completely ban germ line gene editing.

The CRISPR inventor, Jennifer Doudna, herself summed it up: "We wanted the scientific community to hit the pause button until the social, ethical, ecological and philosophical implications of germ line editing could be properly and thoroughly discussed ideally at the global level."

It was concluded at the conference that though it was too early to do germ line editing safely, but someday it would happen and the goal should be to provide prudent guidelines. This holds the key to the future of this marvelous invention.

Arrest the COVID wave as lockdown is not an option

Any congregation, be it election rallies, religious or social gatherings, must be immediately banned if the pandemic is to be controlled

There is a familiar sense of dread in the air and a feeling of *déjà vu*. That is because, what we are witnessing right now is a rerun of last year and at vastly alarming proportions than before. The new strain of the Coronavirus is creating havoc across the country and straining the existing healthcare system once again.

Railway stations and bus depots are getting packed once again with migrant workers trying to catch a public transport back home. Once gain, we can see motley groups of migrant workers silently trudging back home with all their worldly belongings on their drooping shoulders. Thankfully, this time the exodus on foot does not seem to be as major as the last time because the trains and buses are still running.

Messages of total lock-

down are constantly being shared by State-level Ministers, even as the Centre is maintaining that localised containment is the best solution to effectively bring the pandemic under control.

The only fact emerging from this second wave sweeping the nation is that India has failed to take lessons from the total lockdown and the first COVID wave that hit it last year. As the experts rightly point out, somewhere towards the beginning of this year, when the active cases across the country started to come down drastically, the Government and citizens alike, threw caution to the winds. The best example of this was the number of weddings which took place in the last couple of months or the long queues outside restaurants for a seat at the table. People, tired of being stuck in the house for almost

a year, forgot that masks and social distancing are going to be a part of our everyday existence for a long time to come. From weekly bazaars to shopping malls or airports, not to forget the recent festival of Holi and the Maha Kumbh in Uttarakhand, everywhere there is a massive crowd to be seen.

It was only a matter of time before the contagion started spreading exponentially. This explosion of cases that we are witnessing now was imminent and new studies suggest that the virus strain is much more infectious, even though the mortality rate could be lower.

What, therefore, needs to be done before India shuts down again for business and a year of irreparable economic damage is registered? First, as the Prime Minister has been saying, "track, trace and isolate." India, in the last two



weeks, has again got back to ramping up its testing infrastructure to identify the patients. However, the strategy should not have been discarded or taken lightly in the first instance. It took a while to set up centres testing for COVID across the country and there were instances of mandatory negative reports before anyone was allowed free movement across borders. The creation of micro-containment zones to stop the spread of infections was also an

effective tool, thereby leaving the larger area open for economic activities. It is time to revisit these lessons learnt last year.

Any congregation, be it election rallies, religious or social gatherings, must be immediately banned if the pandemic is to be controlled in any manner. It is a mockery of the citizens' patience and persistence if local lockdowns are imposed in some cities or districts thereby curtailing free movement, while thousands congregate to celebrate the festival of democracy, or mammoth religious events like the Kumbh Mela. There has to be political will cutting across party lines to immediately priorities public health and prevent the spread of the contagion by voluntarily calling off any public rallies in the remaining phases of elections.

The migrants have already

started to trickle back into their towns and villages from the big cities, bringing with them unknown variants of the virus. Any mass spread of the pandemic in rural belts and smaller towns may cripple the backbone of India. Any amount of night curfew or complete lockdown may not be able to contain the spread of the disease if a sizeable chunk gets infected.

India has achieved a great feat by vaccinating over 10 crore people in 86 days since the exercise began. However, vaccine shortages are being reported from across the country. First the Central Government should ensure that all States, down to the last district, get the appropriate number of vaccines and are prepared to face any life-threatening conditions due to the jab.

It is an established fact now that the new variant of the

virus may make the vaccine less effective even though the mortality rates are still within control. India was one of the largest suppliers of vaccines to the world and it is time the focus shifts to domestic use. As we read this, there are five more vaccines awaiting the Government's nod in order to be introduced into the market. Speedy approval and speedier delivery of the Sputnik V vaccine in India could go a long way in saving lives. The Government needs to rethink its vaccine strategy and provide financial support to private players to ramp up production. Plus, based on vaccine availability they should allow every willing person to start taking the jab. All the facets of this deadly disease are still unknown, however, last year's knowledge and the preventive shield of the vaccine are always reliable options.

‘US troops pulling out of Af worrying for India’

After the withdrawal of the US and NATO troops from Afghanistan by September 11, India will have tremendous concern on the resurgence of the Taliban and the war-torn country being used as a safe haven for terrorists, according to experts here.

US President Joe Biden on Wednesday announced that all American troops would be withdrawn from Afghanistan by September 11 this year to end the country's longest war. Following suit, the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) said it will also pull out its troops from Afghanistan.

Biden said his administration will ask other countries in the region to do more to support Afghanistan, especially Pakistan, as well as Russia, China, India, and Turkey. "They all have a significant stake in the stable future for Afghanistan," Biden said. "We will not conduct a hasty rush to the exit. We'll do it responsibly, deliberately, and safely. And we will do it in full coordination with our allies and partners, who now have more forces in Afghanistan than we do," he said.



But, US experts said regional countries, especially India will view the complete withdrawal of American troops from Afghanistan with tremendous concern and the role of the Taliban militants after the pull out of the Western forces from the war-torn country.

"Regional countries, especially India, will have tremendous concerns about the US pullout from Afghanistan and the likelihood of a Taliban resurgence in the country," Lisa Curtis, who was Deputy Assistant to the President and NSC Senior Director for South and Central Asia from 2017-2021 under the previous Donald Trump administration, told PTI.

Oz to withdraw last 80 troops from Afghanistan

Canberra: Australia would complete its troop withdrawal from Afghanistan in September in line with the United States and other allies, the prime minister said Thursday. Australia's contribution to the NATO-led mission had once exceeded 15,000 personnel, but only 80 remain.

"In line with the United States and other allies and partners, the last remaining Australian troops will depart Afghanistan in September," Prime Minister Scott Morrison said, without nominating a day.

Blinken in Afghanistan to sell Biden troop withdrawal

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken made an unannounced visit to Afghanistan on Thursday to sell Afghan leaders and a wary public on President Joe Biden's decision to withdraw all American troops from the country and end America's longest war.

Blinken sought to assure senior Afghan politicians that the United States remains committed to the country despite Biden's announcement a day earlier that the 2,500 US soldiers remaining in the country would be coming home by the 20th anniversary of the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks that led to the US invasion in 2001.

"I wanted to demonstrate with my visit the ongoing to commitment of the United States to the Islamic Republic and the people of Afghanistan," Blinken told Afghan President Ashraf Ghani as they met at the presidential palace in Kabul.

"The partnership is changing, but the partnership itself is enduring," Blinken said. "We respect the decision and are adjusting our priorities," Ghani told Blinken, expressing gratitude for the sacrifices of US troops.

Later, in a meeting with Abdullah Abdullah, who heads

the National Reconciliation Council, Blinken repeated his message, saying that "we have a new chapter, but it is a new chapter that we're writing together."

"We are grateful to your people, your country, your administration," Abdullah said.

‘Terrorist forces’ may take advantage: China

Beijing: China on Thursday voiced concern over America's decision to withdraw all its troops from Afghanistan by September, saying the US should accommodate the legitimate security concerns of the regional countries to prevent "terrorist forces" from taking advantage of the chaos in the war-torn country.

Beijing also slammed Washington for linking the

withdrawal of the US troops from Afghanistan to focus more on the threats posed by China, saying the fight against terrorism is in the common interest of all parties, including the two countries.

"The current security situation in Afghanistan is still complex and grim and the problem of terrorism is far from being solved. Foreign troops stationed in Afghanistan

should withdraw in a responsible and orderly manner to ensure a smooth transition in Afghanistan and to avoid terrorist forces from taking advantage of chaos," Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian told a media briefing here while responding to questions on US troops pullout plan.

"The US is the biggest external factor affecting the issue of Afghanistan... It must

take full responsibility for preserving the outcomes of Afghanistan's peaceful construction and reconstruction and accommodate legitimate security concerns of the countries in the region," he said.

To a question that the US is linking its troops withdrawal to focus on China, Zhao said, "the US side links its withdrawal from Afghanistan to China's challenge."

Top associate of Navalny convicted of trespassing in Russia

Moscow: A top associate of Russia's imprisoned opposition leader Alexei Navalny was convicted of trespassing Thursday and handed a suspended sentence of one year community service after she tried to doorstep an alleged security operative believed to be involved in Navalny's poisoning with a Soviet-era nerve agent.

A court in Moscow found Lyubov Sobol, a politician and a key figure in Navalny's Anti-

Corruption Foundation, guilty of forcing her way into the apartment of a relative of the alleged operative whom Navalny had previously duped into revealing details of his supposed poisoning.

Sobol condemned the verdict as "shame and disgrace" and vowed to appeal.

"In the meantime, a (criminal) case into the attempt upon Navalny's life hasn't been even opened," she said in a

tweet. Navalny, Russian President Vladimir Putin's fiercest critic, fell sick during an August 20 flight in Russia and was flown to Berlin while still in a coma for treatment two days later. Labs in Germany, France and Sweden, and tests by the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons, established that he was exposed to a Soviet-era Novichok nerve agent.

The 44-year-old politician has blamed the poisoning on the Kremlin, accusations Russian officials have rejected. In December, while still convalescing in Germany, Navalny released a recording of a phone call he said he made to a man he identified as Konstantin Kudryavtsev and described as an alleged member of a group of officers of the Federal Security Service, or FSB, who purportedly poi-

US expels Russian diplomats, imposes new round of sanctions

The Biden administration on Thursday announced the expulsion of 10 Russian diplomats and sanctions against nearly three dozen people and companies as it moved to hold the Kremlin accountable for interference in last year's presidential election and the hacking of federal agencies.

The actions, foreshadowed for weeks by the administration, represent the first retaliatory measures announced against the Kremlin for the hack, familiarly known as the SolarWinds breach.

In that intrusion, Russian hackers are believed to have infected widely used software with malicious code, enabling them to access the networks of at least nine agencies in what US officials believe was an intelligence-gathering operation aimed at mining government secrets.

Besides that hack, US officials last month alleged that Russian President Vladimir Putin authorized influence operations to help Donald Trump in his unsuccessful bid for reelection as president, though there's no evidence

Russia or anyone else changed votes or manipulated the outcome.

The measures announced Thursday include sanctions on six Russian companies that support the country's cyber activities, in addition to sanctions on 32 individuals and entities accused of attempting to interfere in last year's presidential election, including by spreading disinformation.

The 10 diplomats being expelled include representatives of Russian intelligence services, the White House said. The White House also said Biden was using diplomatic, military and intelligence channels to respond to reports that Russia encouraged the Taliban to attack US and allied troops in Afghanistan based on the "best assessments" of the intelligence community.

Reports of alleged "bounties" surfaced last year, with the Trump administration coming under fire for not raising the issue directly with Russia. The White House did not publicly confirm the reports. "The safety and well-being of U.S. Military personnel, and that of our allies and partners, is an absolute priority of the United

States," the White House said Thursday.

It was not immediately clear what, if any, other actions might be planned against Russia. Officials had previously said they expected to take actions both seen and unseen.

The sanctions, presumably intended to send a clear retaliatory message to Russia and to deter similar acts in the future, are certain to exacerbate an already tense relationship between the U.S. and Russia.

President Joe Biden told Putin this week in their second call to "de-escalate tensions" following a Russian military buildup on Ukraine's border, and said the U.S. would "act firmly in defense of its national interests" regarding Russian intrusions and election interference. In a television interview last month, Biden replied "I do" when asked if he thought Putin was a "killer." He said the days of the

U.S. "rolling over" to Putin were done. Putin later recalled his ambassador to the US and pointed at the US history of slavery and slaughtering Native Americans and the atomic bombing of Japan in World War II.

France urges its nationals in Pak to leave country after violent protests

The French embassy here on Thursday advised all French nationals in Pakistan to temporarily leave the country after violent protests by a radical religious group that has now been banned by the government.

The Tehreek-i-Labaik Pakistan (TLP) took to streets on Monday to launch violent protests to force the government to expel the French ambassador over blasphemous caricatures published last year.

Though no French citizen was reportedly targeted so far but the embassy has urged all the French citizens to leave Pakistan, apparently as a precautionary measure.

"Due to the serious threats to French interests in Pakistan, French nationals and French companies are advised to temporarily leave the country," the embassy said in an email message to its citizens in Pakistan.

It said that the departures will be carried out by existing commercial airlines. Interior minister Sheikh

Rashid announced on Wednesday to ban the TLP and officials said that Prime Minister Imran Khan and his cabinet endorsed the summary by the interior ministry to outlaw the group.

The trouble began after police arrested the TLP chief Saad Rizvi on Monday ahead of the April 20 deadline by the group to expel the French ambassador.

The issue of expulsion of the ambassador was linked to an agreement between the TLP and the government when the former in November last year postponed its protest against publication of blasphemous cartoons.

Initially the government had agreed that it would take action to fulfill the demand of expulsion of the French ambassador by February but later on the two sides agreed to set April 20 as the new deadline.

However, when Rizvi was arrested the TLP in coordinated protests blocked main roads in all major cities and the protests turned violent when police tried to remove them.

WPI inflation spikes to over 8-year high of 7.39% in Mar

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

The wholesale price-based inflation shot up to over 8-year high of 7.39 per cent in March on rising crude oil and metal prices.

Also, the low base of March last year, when the data was computed with a low response rate due to the nationwide lockdown, contributed to the spike in inflation in March 2021.

The WPI inflation was 4.17 per cent in February 2021 and 0.42 per cent in March 2020.

This is the third straight month of up-tick seen in the wholesale price index (WPI)

based inflation.

“The annual rate of inflation stood at 7.39 per cent (provisional) for the month of March 2021 over March 2020,” the Commerce and Industry Ministry said.

Such a high level of WPI was last recorded in October 2012, when inflation was 7.4 per cent.

Inflation in food articles in March was 3.24 per cent as prices of pulses, fruits and paddy hardened.

In pulses, it was 13.14 per cent in March, while in fruits and paddy, inflation was 16.33 per cent and 1.38 per cent, respectively.

In vegetables, the rate of

price rise softened to (-) 5.19 per cent, against (-) 2.90 per cent in the previous month.

Inflation in the fuel and power basket was 10.25 per cent in March, against 0.58 per cent in February on higher fuel prices. In manufactured products, inflation was 7.34 per cent.

“The prices of crude oil, petroleum products and basic metal substantially increased in March 2021 as compared to the corresponding month of last year. Also, due to nationwide lockdown, the WPI index for the month of March 2020 was computed with a relatively low response rate,” the ministry said while releasing the WPI data.

Citi to exit consumer banking biz in India, to focus on institutional segment

American banking major Citibank on Thursday announced exiting the high visibility consumer banking business in India as part of a global strategy.

The consumer banking business comprises credit cards, retail banking, home loans and wealth management. The bank will be exiting the segment in India after more than three decades.

The bank has 35 branches in the country and employs approximately 4,000 people in the consumer banking business.

On Thursday, the bank announced exiting from the consumer banking businesses in 13 countries, with its glob-

al CEO Jane Fraser attributing the decision to an absence of scale to compete in these geographies.

Contours of the exit were not immediately known and the proposed exit from the consumer banking business will also need regulatory approvals.

“There is no immediate change to our operations and no immediate impact to our colleagues as a result of this announcement.

In the interim, we will continue to serve our clients with the same care, empathy and dedication that we do today,” Citi India’s Chief Executive Ashu Khullar said.

“... the sharpened strategy announced today will strengthen our ability to bring the full global power of Citi to

our institutional clients, reinforcing our leading positions across corporate, commercial and investment banking, treasury and trade solutions, as well as markets securities services,” he added.

Citi had entered India in 1902 and started the consumer banking business in 1985.

From a social perspective, the consumer bank had extended loans of Rs 27,911 crore to agriculture, affordable housing, renewable and MSMEs (Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises) as of March 2020.

Of that amount, Rs 4,975 crore was extended to weaker sections as part of Citibank India’s priority sector lending obligations, as per a release issued by the bank last year.

Markets extend gains to 2nd day as banks, financial stocks rally

Sensex and Nifty closed in the green after a volatile session on Thursday as investors accumulated banking, finance and select IT counters despite an unabated rise in COVID-19 cases.

A recovering rupee and positive global cues also propped up the bourses, traders said.

After gyrating 877 points during the day, the 30-share BSE Sensex ended 259.62 points or 0.53 per cent higher at 48,803.68.

Similarly, the broader NSE Nifty advanced 76.65 points or 0.53 per cent to 14,581.45.

TCS topped the Sensex gainers’ chart, climbing 3.67 per cent, followed by ONGC, ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank, Dr Reddy’s, HDFC, Axis Bank and HCL Tech.

On the other hand, Infosys was the biggest loser, dropping 2.65 per cent after its March 2021 quarter earnings missed market expectations.

The IT services major had on Wednesday posted a 17.5 per cent rise in net profit to Rs 5,076 crore for the March quarter, and announced up to Rs 9,200 crore buyback offer at a maximum price of Rs 1,750 per share.

RBI sets up RRA to streamline regulations and reduce compliance

The Reserve Bank on Thursday set up the second Regulatory Review Authority (RRA 2.0) with a view to streamlining regulations and reducing compliance burden of regulated entities.

Reserve Bank of India Deputy Governor M Rajeshwar Rao has been appointed as the Regulations Review Authority, the central bank said in a statement.

The RBI had set up a

Regulations Review Authority (RRA) initially for a period of one year from April 1, 1999, for reviewing regulations, circulars, reporting systems, based on the feedback from public, banks and financial institutions. The recommendations of the RRA enabled streamlining and increasing the effectiveness of several procedures, simplifying regulatory prescriptions, paved the way for issuance of master circular and reduced reporting burden on regulated entities.

Amazon announces \$250 mln fund for small, medium businesses in India

E-commerce giant Amazon on Thursday announced a USD 250 million (about Rs 1,873 crore) fund that will focus on digitising small and medium businesses, and driving innovation in the areas of agri-tech and health-tech in India.

“Small and medium sized businesses are often the engine and the lifeblood of economies and I think it’s true in India as well. And we are very passionate about trying to enable

acceleration of SMBs in fuelling innovation and the economy in India,” Amazon Web Services CEO Andrew Jassy said.

Building on last year’s announcement, Amazon is announcing a new USD 250 million Amazon Smbhav Venture Fund, Jassy, who will take over as the CEO of Amazon Inc later this year, said during the second Amazon Smbhav event.

He noted that Amazon intends to help inspire more SMBs to be able to build brand new businesses.

Private equity inflow in India realty up 19% in FY21

Mumbai: Bucking the pandemic private equity investments into the India real estate sector rose around 19 per cent in FY 2020-21 to over \$6.27 billion, according to an Anarock report. During the previous financial year, PE investments into the realty sector stood at \$5.8 billion. Indian real estate recorded its highest-ever private equity investments since in the last fiscal, since FY16, noted the Anarock Capital’s ‘Flux - FY20-21 Market Monitor for Capital Flows’.

India’s March merchandise exports rises by over 60% YoY

New Delhi: Base effect, along with healthy demand conditions abroad, pushed India’s merchandise exports higher by 60.29 per cent on a year on year basis in March 2021, official data showed on Thursday.

The country’s merchandise exports during the month under review increased to \$34.45 billion as compared to \$21.49 billion in March 2020.

Curiously, the general insurance industry officials while hoping for a growth, are uncertain about the prospects for FY22, as they are faced with negative consumer sentiment; the reduction in cash flow due to withdrawal of long-term motor policy; lower investment yield and muted growth owing to economy affected by Covid-19 pandemic.

The 34-member Indian general insurance industry closed last fiscal with 5.2 per cent growth with a premium of Rs 198,734.68 crore up from Rs 188,916.61 crore logged in FY20.

“The uncertainty is high owing to the Covid-19 pandemic. The consumer sentiment is negative.

The health insurance portfolio will continue to do well. The motor insurance business should do well if the economy doesn’t deteriorate further. Some sport utility vehicles (SUV) have waiting periods,” Roopam Asthana, CEO and the Whole Time Director, Liberty General Insurance Ltd told IANS.

Recently, I got my hands on the Refreshed BMW 6-series, it takes this very nice sportback sedan to another level of refinement. Driving it in the 630i M Sport trim is extremely engaging. I have always liked BMW's two-litre turbocharged petrol engine with the 30i moniker and 250 horsepower. This particular one, running the longer-wheelbase variant of the 5-series platform, will go up against the recently refreshed E-Class sedan from Mercedes-Benz. Honestly, in this segment, the Mercedes wins out, not because it is the better vehicle but because of the badge value. The E-Class is the standard luxury sedan of choice for the companies and governments alike. It is the car, once you hit a certain age, that you want to be seen in.

But, as the title of this piece suggests, I have a preference for BMWs. While I am not alone among automotive writers here because other than a few dastardly misses with exterior design, they are all very engaging to drive, and we will not get into the mad-cap super-sedans that all the German companies put out. But sitting behind the wheel of the 6-series, I realised why I really enjoy driving a BMW even bumper-to-bumper traffic in the city. I love BMW's iDrive system, and one major reason is because it has been most consistent in terms of functionality among all the luxury car manufacturers. I experienced this system over a decade ago, there has been a consistency to the way it functions.

There has been no sudden dramatic change between generations of the iDrive system. Although it has come a long way from the very basic system that I first experienced on the E65 7-

More than performance, BMW has always been on the ball when it comes to their infotainment system — the fabled iDrive

series years ago, the fact that the click-wheel, despite touchpads and touchscreens being added over the years, and the button layout on the centre console added in the third iteration of the system, remain the same. Of all the infotainment and car control systems of any manufacturer, I can find my way around the iDrive system just by feel. While it was called 'iDrive' because the 'i' was then in vogue, thanks to Apple. I must admit that the system, like iOS, has evolved without drama over the years.

On top of that, BMW's integration with iOS is among the most compre-

hensive of any carmaker and over the years, they have taken out the kinks. For example, BMW was the first carmaker to have wireless connectivity for Apple CarPlay. And initially working one's way through the menus to connect an iPhone through CarPlay could take a reasonable amount of time even if you knew your way around the system. On cars like the 6-series that run the eighth-generation iDrive system, it takes under 30 seconds. Honestly for the life of me I do not understand why other luxury carmakers haven't done wireless connectivity as yet, particularly since every new iPhone or even mid-

spec Chinese Android phone has wireless inductive charging and all cars come with a wireless charging bay.

There are many good reasons to choose a BMW, after all, they are great to drive like this 630i is.
