Pak agrees to keep LoC calm

India, Pak DGMOs say 2 armies will honour 2003 ceasefire pact; but it doesn't restrict Indian forces from carrying out anti-terrorist, anti-infiltration ops in J&K

In a major step to reduce tension at the Line of Control (LoC), India and Pakistan on Thursday decided to strictly adhere to a ceasefire for "mutually beneficial and sustainable peace."



The agreement arrived at between the Director Generals of Military Operations (DGMOs) on Thursday was aimed at avoiding civilian casualties on either side during firing.

However, the ceasefire, which came into force from midnight of February 24-25, will not restrict the Indian security forces from carrying out anti-terrorist and anti-infiltration operations in Jammu & Kashmir, it was clarified here.

Agreeing to adhere to the ceasefire announced by then Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee in 2003, a joint statement issued by both the countries said the two armies will observe all agreements on ceasefire along the 750-km long LoC and other sectors, according to a joint statement issued on Thursday.

The decision was taken during talks between India DGMO Lt General PS Sangha and his Pakistani counterpart Major General Nauman Zakaria on the hotline.

Discussions and reviewed the situation along the LoC in a "free, frank and cordial atmosphere", the statement said.

It added that in the interest of achieving mutually beneficial and sustainable peace along the borders, the two DGMOs agreed to address each other's core issues and concerns which have propensity to disturb peace and lead to violence.

Both sides agreed for strict observance of all agreements, understandings and ceasefire along the LoC and all other sectors with effect from midnight 24/25 February 2021.

Both sides reiterated that existing mechanisms of hotline contact and border flag meetings will be utilised to resolve any unforeseen situation or

misunderstanding. Incidentally, the two armies in 2018 had also agreed to follow the 2003 guidelines. However, situation remained volatile at the LoC.

Sources said the latest pact came about after rounds of back channel talks between the two countries over the last few months, adding National Security Adviser (NSA) Ajit Doval held talks in this regard with Prime Minister Imran Khan's special assistant Moed W Yusuf.

Pakistan Army Chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa, the most powerful figure there to shape the national policies, earlier this month also favoured talks and said it is time to extend a hand of peace in all directions.

In Pakistan, Army spokesperson Major General Babar Iftikhar said regarding the joint statement that "there have been contacts between India and Pakistan on a hotline level since 1987. Frequently, the DGMOs of both countries stay in contact through this established mechanism."

According to media report from there, he also said from 2014 there was a spike in ceasefire violations along the LoC. "Both the DGMOs have agreed that the existing 2003 understanding should be implemented in letter and spirit," he added.

Dawn newspaper said the latest development is seen as a thaw after years of tension between the two nuclear-armed neighbours. Both Prime Minister Imran Khan and Army Chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa recently offered India to resolve all issues through dialogue.

Ties between India and Pakistan nosedived after a terror attack on the Pathankot Air Force base in 2016 by terror groups based in the neighbouring country. Subsequent attacks, including one on the Indian Army camp in Uri, deteriorated the relationship.

The relationship dipped further after IAF carried out air strikes against a Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) terrorist training camp in Balakot on

February 26, 2019 in response to the Pulwama terror attack in which 40 Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) jawans were killed on February 15 the same year.

The ties between the two countries worsened after India in 2019 announced abrogation of Article 370 giving special status to Jammu & Kashmir and divided the State into two Union Territories.

There were 5,133 ceasefire violations last year in which 22 civilians were killed and 71 injured on the Indian side. Moreover, 24 security personnel were also killed in the firing while 126 were wounded. Moreover, nearly 300 incidents of ceasefire violation were recorded till January end this year.

In a written response to a question in the Lok Sabha earlier this month, Union Minister of State for Home G Kishan Reddy said a total of 10,752 cases of ceasefire violations have taken place along India's border with Pakistan in the last three years, in which 72 security personnel and 70 civilians were killed.

He said 364 security personnel and 341 civilians were injured in cross-border firings along the International Border and the LoC in Jammu & Kashmir in 2018, 2019 and 2020.

Centre frames rules for OTT, social media apps

Tightening its grip on unregulated media, the Government on Thursday announced a set of stringent regulations for social media firm like Facebook and Twitter as well as OTT players such as Netflix, requiring them to remove any content flagged by authorities within 36 hours and setting up a complaint redressal mechanism with an officer being based in the country.

The guidelines will also apply to popular mobile apps like WhatsApp and Telegram. The Government also announced guidelines for news portals operating from India, asking them to keep the rules and norms applicable to print and TV channel codes.

This is the first time such rules have been framed for digital and online media operating within the country's jurisdiction. IT Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad addressing media with I&B Minister Prakash Javadekar said concerns have been raised over rampant abuse of social media platforms and spread of fake news. To fix the fake ID users, the guidelines also insisted that social media platforms must verify the users through mobile phone firms.

"Social media companies are welcome to do business in India, and empower Indians...We welcome criticism and dissent... But it is important that users of social media are given a proper forum for the resolution of their grievances in a time-bound manner," Prasad said.

Prasad said intermediaries will fall into two categories — social media intermediary and significant social media intermediary. This distinction is based on the number of users on the social media platform, and the Government will soon notify the threshold of the user base that will distinguish the two. The rules require the "significant" social media intermediaries to follow additional due diligence including the appointment of chief compliance officer, a nodal contact person and a resident grievance officer. All the three officials will have to be resident-citizens of India.

The guidelines also make it mandatory for platforms such

as Twitter and WhatsApp to identify the originator of a message that authorities consider to be anti-national and against the security and sovereignty of the country. The rules about digital media and OTT focus more on in-house and self-regulation mechanism whereby a robust grievance redressal mechanism has been provided while upholding journalistic and creative freedom.

As per the guidelines, all social media, OTT platforms and news portals must have a resident Indian citizen grievance officer to handle the complaints. He must make a decision in 15 days and must maintain monthly data of such complaints. Social media and OTT firms also must have resident Indian citizen compliance officer and nodal officer, who will be responsible in responding to the Government agencies.

UK court says Nirav has a case to answer in India

The UK's Westminster Magistrates' Court on Thursday ruled that diamond merchant and prime accused in the PNB credit fraud case Nirav Modi has a case to answer before Indian courts. With the UK court now clearing the legal pathway for Modi's extradition, the judgment will now need ratification of British Home Secretary Priti Patel for sending the fugitive back to India.



to send his case to the Secretary of the State, the UK for final decision," the CBI said in a statement.

India is a designated Part 2 country under the Extradition Act 2003 and the UK's Cabinet Minister has the authority to order the requested person's extradition after considering a number of further issues.

Under the Act, the Secretary of State must consider the possibility of imposition of the death penalty, in which case extradition cannot be ordered; the rule of speciality, which prohibits a person being dealt with in the requesting state for matters

other than those referenced in the extradition request; and whether or not the person was in the UK following extradition from another state, in which case that state's permission must be obtained before extraditing to a third state.

If these factors do not apply, the Minister must order extradition within two months of the day on which the District Judge referred his decision to the office of Secretary of State, in this case by the end of April.

The Home Secretary's order rarely goes against the court's conclusions, as she has to consider only these provisions under the Act which cannot apply as the court has already junked those claims of the defendant.

However, the Westminster's court has granted Modi a window of appeal in the High Court and has up to 14 days to make that application after the Home Secretary makes her decision known. Any appeal, if granted, will be heard at the Administrative Division of the High Court in London.

DCGI seeks more data for Sputnik V emergency use approval in India

Sputnik V, the Russian vaccine against the Covid-19, will have to wait longer to get approval for emergency use authorisation (EUA) in India.

The country's top drug regulator's subject expert committee (SEC) has asked Hyderabad-based Dr Reddy's Laboratories to submit more data before a final decision could be taken about its fate.

Dr Reddy's Lab is locally conducting clinical trials on Sputnik V.

The DCGI decision seeking more data from Dr Reddy's has been slammed by a section of health experts. They contended when the Covishield by Serum Institute of India and Covaxin by Bharat Biotech can get EUA without complete data, then why the nod for the Russian vaccine was being held up despite it showing good preliminary results.

Dr Reddy's Lab had applied to the Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation on February 19 for EUA as the human adenoviral vector-based vaccine candidate.

Delhi Govt to convert its fleet of cars into electric vehicles within 6 months

The Delhi Government has directed all its departments and autonomous bodies to switch their entire fleet of hired cars for electric vehicles within six months.

The Government, which has over 2,000 cars in its fleet, said it hopes its decision will inspire other cities in the country and the world to tackle the issues of pollution and climate change with the urgency they deserve.

The announcement came a day after the Aam Aadmi Party-led Government launched campaign "Switch Delhi" to encourage private vehicle owners to take a pledge to shift to electric vehicles and install a charging point within their premises in the next three years.

"It's history! Driven by the vision of CM @ArvindKejriwal to make Delhi the 'Electric Vehicle capital', Delhi govt today became the 1st in the world, not just India, to mandate its entire hired car fleet to switch to electric WITHIN a deadline - 6 mths. @SwitchDelhi begins at home," Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia tweeted.



Over 2,000 cars will be impacted by this decision and will transition to EVs in next 6 months. We hope this decision inspires cities and govt around India and the world to tackle the pollution and climate change problem with the seriousness and urgency it deserves," he said.

The Delhi Government had in August last year launched an Electric Vehicle Policy to tackle the problem of air pollution. Under the policy, it promised to waive registration fee, road tax, and provide an incentive of up to Rs 1.5 lakh

for new cars in the national Capital.

Under Delhi's EV policy, 12 four-wheeler models are available and eligible for purchase and scrapping incentives.

The Transport Department of Delhi will be the nodal department to monitor the progress of the transition from existing diesel/petrol vehicle fleet to EVs.

"It will also be necessary for all departments to produce monthly action reports on the transition to EVs by the 5th of every month to the nodal department," the Kejriwal Government said in a statement.

Mercury soars to 33.2° C in Delhi, warmer day today

It was a warm Thursday with a clear sky in the national Capital as the maximum temperature settled at 33.2 degrees Celsius and the minimum at 13.4 degrees Celsius, a notch above the season's average, the meteorological office here said.

Humidity was recorded at 96 per cent at 8.30 am, a weather official said. The Palam and the Lodhi Road weather stations recorded maximum temperatures of 31.2 degrees Celsius and 32.6 degrees Celsius respectively, while the one at Ridge area recorded a high of 32.6 degrees Celsius.

The minimum temperature in Ridge and Palam were recorded at 16.4 degrees Celsius and 16.3 degrees Celsius respectively.

The weatherman has predicted mainly clear sky and shallow fog on Friday morning. "The maximum and minimum temperatures would be around 34 degrees Celsius and 13 degrees Celsius respectively," the Met department said.

Test flight lands in Bilaspur, Delhi flights to start from Mar 1

The second flight will arrive from New Delhi at Bilaspur at 4 pm via Prayagraj and return from Bilaspur to Delhi at 4.30 pm via Jabalpur.

Ashwin fastest Indian to take 400 Test wickets

India win 3rd Test against England, inch closer to WTC final

Ravichandran Ashwin on Thursday became only the fourth Indian and sixth spinner in the world to take 400 Test wickets, a feat which was nothing short of a "fairytale" for the seasoned pro who was called a "modern day legend" by skipper Virat Kohli.

Ashwin reached the landmark in the day-night third Test against England here when he dismissed Jofra Archer in England's second innings as India won the 3rd Test and inched closer to WTC final. Left-arm spinner Axar Patel created an illusion of turn with 11 straighter deliveries that put India on the brink of the World Test Championship final with a 10-wicket demolition of

England inside two days in the day-night third Test here on Thursday. The result was their lowest total against India — 81 all out in 30.4 overs leaving the hosts with a target of 49 which they achieved with minimum fuss taking a 2-1 lead in the four-match series. The visitors were also knocked out of contention from the WTC final.

opened in the winning cause. I can't really get a grip of what has happened in the last 2-3 months. It has been a dreamy run and a fairytale," Ashwin, who took seven wickets in the match to tally 431 victims from 77 Tests, said.

Skipper Kohli was effusive in his praise, saying, "I think we need to stand up and take notice of what Ashwin has done. In Tests, he is a modern day legend."

Ashwin credited his self-belief for reaching where he has. "It has been all about self belief. At the start of the Australian tour, I didn't think I would be starting, but then (Ravindra) Jadeja broke down and it might have had to happen," said Ashwin, who played a big role in India's historic Test series win last month.

Former captain Anil Kumble (619), Kapil Dev (434), and Harbhajan Singh (417) are the other Indians who have 400 Test wickets to their credit.

Ashwin also became the second fastest to reach the milestone after Sri Lankan great Muttiah Muralitharan, who made it in his 72nd Test.

The veteran came into the match six short of the landmark and took three England wickets in the first innings.

Talking about the match, he said, "We were worried after getting bowled out for 145, didn't think we didn't have many runs on the board. But we then bowled beautifully on a wicket assisting us."

"I don't know if I'm ageing, but it's incredibly hard to watch the game. To come back (after losing first Test) and win it is even more special." Asked this was his best as a bowler, Ashwin said, "In 2015-16 everyone asked me (if I'm bowling at my best), the same in 2016-17. One thing is sure I've always wanted to improve. I won't be surprised if I improve further in the future."

PGIMER witnesses 100% increase in Covid 19 patient load

With Covid-19 cases witnessing surge across various parts of the country, the Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research has witnessed 100 per cent increase in positive cases over the past ten days.

"The numbers of Covid-19 cases had been consistently diminishing since sometime and were stable for over a month. However, the trend has reversed recently with numbers again rising on a daily basis and there has been a surge of admitted patients from 30 to 57 over last week, making it 100 percent increase in Covid 19 positive here in

PGIMER," said Prof GD Puri, Dean (Academics) & Head, Department of Anaesthesia and Intensive Care, PGIMER.

Prof Puri was assessing the present situation of Covid-19 in PGIMER along with Prof Ashish Bhalla and Dr Inder Pal Singh.

A 250-bedded Nehru Hospital Extension building in PGIMER was earmarked as COVID hospital last year. Till January 16, the PGIMER had taken care of about 2700 seriously ill COVID-positive patients, 7700 suspected COVID patients in various isolation wards and clinically screened more than 12,000 patients in special screening OPDs across the institute. In

January, the COVID cases had decreased in various parts of the region.

Expressing his concern over the consistent rise in the severe and moderate cases of COVID-19 over the last few days here at PGIMER, he said, "COVID-19 pandemic is far from over. With mask use down and mobility up, we are definitely contributing to accelerate the rise in COVID-19 cases."

Earnestly urging healthcare workers and other eligible people to get vaccinated at the earliest, Prof Puri said, "The peerless and fearless frontline warriors have confronted the challenge of COVID-19 so bravely, so why this hesitancy

for vaccination when it is vital for their safety considering their vulnerability due to the exposure at the job. In fact, who knows more than the healthcare workers how deadly COVID-19 can be."

VACCINATION COVERAGE ONLY 26 PER CENT IN CHANDIGARH

The overall COVID-19 vaccination coverage stood at 26 per cent in Chandigarh on Thursday. Since the beginning of vaccination drive on January 16, a total of 20540 healthcare workers and frontline workers have been inoculated in the city.

As per Administration's data, 12132 healthcare workers

against the target of 46378 and 8408 frontline workers against the target of 33620 have been inoculated in Chandigarh.

Till now, 10654 healthcare workers against the target of 24516, accounting for an achievement rate of 43.09 per cent and 8408 (35 per cent) frontline workers against the target of 23584 have received the first dose of vaccination. Apart from this, 1568 HCWs have received the second dose of vaccination till date.

On Thursday, 1990 beneficiaries against the target of 7675 had turned up at various sites to get a shot of vaccination in the city, accounting for an achievement rate of only 25 per cent. 961 healthcare work-

ers against the target of 4172 and 939 frontline workers against the target of 3503 were inoculated.

49 FRESH CASES IN CHD

The union territory of Chandigarh on Thursday reported 49 fresh COVID-19 cases. The active cases increased to 279 in the city. The total tally stood at 21590 in the city, according to the Chandigarh Health Department's evening bulletin.

20 patients have recovered in the past 24 hours taking the total number of recoveries to 20960, it stated. 2.50 lakh samples have so far been tested in the city and 1681 tests were conducted in the last 24 hours.

Haryana to table anti-conversion bill in upcoming Budget Session, says Home Minister Vij

Chandigarh: In line with some other BJP ruled states, Haryana government will bring in a bill against religious conversions through force or fraudulent means in the upcoming budget session of the Assembly, state Home Minister Anil Vij said here on Thursday.

Presiding over a meeting of a committee formed to draft the bill recently, the state home minister had said, "The enactment of this law will prevent any attempt to get religious conversion by force, inducement, bluff of marriage or by any other unethical methods by anyone in the state."

On Thursday, he told reporters, "We have prepared a

draft of the bill against religious conversions (through force or fraud) and it will be brought in the coming budget session of Haryana Vidhan Sabha."

Vij had earlier said that the "drafting committee" formed to frame the bill comprised Secretary, Home-I Department, T L Satyaprakash; Additional Director General of Police Navdeep Singh Virk and Additional Advocate General Deepak Manchanda. In November last year, Vij had announced the setting up of the three-member committee to draft a bill against "love jihad", a term used by BJP leaders to describe religious conversions in the guise of marriage. Himachal Budget Session to begin today

The budget session of Himachal Vidhan Sabha commencing on Friday is likely to be a stormy affair with the Congress gearing up to corner the BJP Government led by Jai Ram Thakur on the issues of Covid-19 management, price rise, farmers' issues among others.

The Vidhan Sabha is reassembling after a gap of almost five months as the winter session, scheduled to be held in December, was called off due to the surge in Covid-19 cases in the state.

The budget session will be held under strict COVID-19

measures and will conclude on March 20.

The Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur, who holds the portfolio of Finance would present the budget estimates for the financial year 2021-22 on March 6.

Leader of opposition and Congress leader Mukesh Agnihotri on Thursday said that the party will raise the issues of farmers, price rise, mismanagement of COVID-19 situation, financial crisis among other issues during the assembly session.

Agnihotri said that the government has been running away from the questions of opposition.

Punjab's 63 hospitals gets show cause notices for not following AB-SSBY guidelines

Acting on the reports and complaints of discrepancies regarding the implementation of AB-Sarbat Sehat Bima Yojna (SSBY), Punjab's State Anti-Fraud Unit has issued 77 show-cause notices to 63 erring hospitals.

"SAFU was directed to actively monitor, pursue any instance of fraud or irregularity observed under the AB-SSBY and take stringent action on every erring entity," said the state Health and Family Welfare Minister Balbir Singh Sidhu on Thursday.

The Minister said that Punjab's State Health Agency's (SHA) Chief Executive Officer Amit Kumar, who is also SAFU Committee chairman, informed that 77 show cause notices have been issued so far to the hospitals and penalty amount of Rs 27,67,358 has been recovered from various

hospitals, while 14 hospitals have been de-empanelled and nine have been temporarily suspended.

Besides, 24 hospitals have been issued warning letters, while seven hospitals have also been issued advisories, added the Minister.

Giving details about major discrepancies made by hospitals, Sidhu said that State SAFU team have cracked wrong referral cases, money taken cases from beneficiaries for medicines and treatment by the empanelled hospitals, claiming money for ICU wards whereas the patient was admitted in the general ward, claiming money for the bilateral surgical procedures whereas the unilateral procedure was performed, denial of cashless treatment by the empanelled hospital to the beneficiaries and more than one surgical package claimed during a single hospitalization.

To avail the easy access of

secondary and tertiary treatment services under the SSBY, the Minister said that the Punjab Government has also established the District Anti-Fraud Units (DAFU) in all districts to check these types of deeds.

"DAFU has been directed to take immediate action, if any health establishment under ABSSBY is found to indulge in fraudulent means.

After a thorough investigation, concerned DAUFU puts up the case to the State Anti-Fraud Unit for further action," he said.

"To reduce the financial burden of people, Punjab Government is vigorously working to cover all patients and around 828 hospitals have been empanelled across the State," he said, adding that the Government has also established District Grievances Redressal Committees for redressal of grievances of beneficiaries.

Punjab implements 301 reforms, reducing 300 compliances

To give a further boost to the industry and trade in the border state of Punjab, the State Government on Thursday maintained that it has successfully implemented 301 reforms while the reduction of 300 compliances by 17 different departments was in progress.

The reforms were part of the State Reforms Action Plan (SRAP) 2020-21, implemented across different departments. The state Chief Secretary Vini Mahajan reviewed the implementation of SRAP while chairing a meeting of the concerned Administrative Secretaries on Thursday.

Mahajan directed the Department heads to ensure proper implementation of all reforms and reduce the compliance burden for industries so that Punjab shall lead the country in 'ease of doing business' for the industry and trade as well as for citizen-centric ser-

vices providing 'ease of living' for the people in the State.

The state Principal Secretary (Industries and Commerce) Alok Shekhar informed that these 301 reforms have been implemented by the concerned departments and all evidences have been submitted to the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) within the stipulated time by January 31.

The DPIIT will rank the states based on the user feedback against these 301 reforms for which user data from November 1, 2020, to April 30, 2021, will be considered. Till date, more than 4,000 satisfied users have been generated across various services by the respective departments with customer feedback.

The Chief Secretary appreciated the efforts undertaken by all the departments in implementation of reforms and further directed the concerned

Administrative Secretaries to disseminate the information as well as engage with stakeholders to create awareness about the new reforms implemented and online services developed.

The progress of reducing regulatory compliance burden was also reviewed by the Chief Secretary at the meeting.

Principal Secretary (Industries and Commerce) further informed that the exercise of reduction of compliance burden was being implemented across 31 different departments and about 300 compliances have been identified for reduction by 17 departments.

The Chief Secretary directed the Administrative Secretaries of the remaining 14 departments to study their existing Acts, Rules and Regulations for ensuring that the required action plan to reduce the compliance burden was prepared in a time bound fashion.

Punjab Congress to gherao Raj Bhavan on March 1 against rising prices

Castigating the Centre for "looting" the public, Jakhar slammed the atrocious Rs 25 hike in LPG prices while pointing out that ₹100 have been added to the gas cylinder price already in the last one month by the Centre.

AAP all geared up to take on Cong Govt in Punjab during Budget Session

Punjab's principal opposition party — the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) — is gearing up to take on the Congress Government during the budget session of Punjab Vidhan Sabha, starting March 1, on numerous issues with farm loan waiver, farmers' suicides, SC post-matric scholarship, leading the list.

AAP MLA from Dirba and the Leader of Opposition Harpal Singh Cheema, expressing grave concern over the tragic suicides of debt-ridden farmers in Punjab, said that the people were fed up with the Congress Government's policies.

Cheema, who visited the residence of the farmer father-in-law who committed suicide in Dasuya five days ago to express his condolences to the bereaved family members, said that the Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh's false promises are leading to the deaths in the State which does not seem to affect him.

"Capt Amarinder has promised in his manifesto that he would waive off all the farm loans and relieve them of their debt. But four years have passed, not a single rupee has been waived off. Waiting for this relief, farmers are now

committing suicide in despair," said Cheema, adding that the deceased father-in-law, in their suicide note, had blamed Capt Amarinder and his false promises of loan waiver as the reason for the extreme step.

Cheema said that the incident of Dasuya was not a singular incident of this sort as two days ago, a farmer in Tarn Taran committed suicide because of indebtedness, just a year prior his son had committed suicide because of the same reason.

Highlighting figures related to the farmers' deaths, Cheema said that between June 24 and September 1 last year, more than 65 farmers had committed suicide because of indebtedness.

"The state of farmers in Punjab is grave but this does not seem to affect Capt Amarinder," he said adding that the pro-farmer stance being taken by the Captain government was nothing but a facade.

"In the upcoming budget session, AAP would be the voice of these grieving farmers. AAP would raise the issue of farmers' suicides and loan waiver in the budget session and would fight for the rights of the farmers," said Cheema.

He said: "We will not let Capt Amarinder just sit by

and ruin the State and lives of the people, we will rise up and fight."

Meanwhile, AAP MLA from Jagraon and Deputy Leader of Opposition Sarvjeet Kaur Manukeye lashed out at the Capt Amarinder Government on the matter pertaining to release of the scholarship money to the Dalit students due to which they were facing problems.

"The issue of post-matric scholarship has been haunting the students of Punjab for over a year now. More than 50,000 Dalit students are suffering as they have not been given their degrees because of non-disbursement of funds. Moreover, the survival of over 1,600 colleges is at stake because these funds have still not been released. They are on their verge of closure," she said.

AAP would take up the issue of post-matric scholarship aggressively in the upcoming budget session and would force Capt Amarinder Singh to take swift action against the injustice meted out by him, declared Manukeye.

She pointed that the State witnessed "a mega scam being done by Cabinet Minister Sadhu Singh Dharamsot, who had embezzled the money meant for the scholarships for Dalit students."

Punjab looks for safe transportation of kids amid Covid-19 resurgence

Amidst Covid-19 resurgence in the State, the Punjab Government wants to make the Safe School Vahan Scheme safer for the school children.

With the State's 1,392 schools — both Government and private — reporting more than 700 cases of the novel coronavirus and one casualty since the reopening of school after a gap of more than a month, the state Education Department is initiating steps to check the spread further.

As a part of the same, the Department has asked all the school authorities to ensure safe transportation of the kids by ensuring strict adherence to Covid-19 safety protocols.

According to the available figures, as many as 452 students and 271 teachers have tested positive for the virus till February 21, besides one death of a teacher in Ludhiana.

Notably, the state government had reopened schools for students of classes IX to XII in mid-October last year making parents' consent mandatory for physically attending the school, with the continuation of online mode of study too. On January 7, the Punjab Government also reopened

schools for Classes V to VIII on an optional basis, followed by Classes III and IV from January 27 onwards, while from February 1 onwards, schools were reopened for the rest of the primary classes as well.

Even as majority of the private schools conducted classes in batches for two to three hours every day, the Government schools started classes from 10 am to 3 pm from January 7 onwards, while revising the timings from February 22 onwards for primary classes (9 am to 3 pm) and for middle, high and senior secondary classes (9 am to 3.20 pm). To ensure safe transportation, the State's School Education director (senior secondary) has written to all the District Education Officers, of both senior and elementary education, to implement the safe school vahan scheme. At the same time, they have been asked to make the parents aware about the same by conducting the parent-teacher meetings.

Along with the letter, the school education director has also attached the previous order of the State Education Department and also the state Transport Department order regarding the scheme.

Restoration of City Centre Sec 17 grey concrete facade begins in Chandigarh

The buildings in City Centre, Sector 17 will soon get a makeover as its grey concrete facade will be restored. The Chandigarh Administration

has begun the restoration process of private heritage buildings in Sector 17 here.

In phase I of the project, Rs 3.80 crore will be spent on the restoration of facade and corridor flooring of SCOs 33- 40 and 45 to 111. The work is like-

ly to be completed by December 2021.

This is for the first time that the work on restoration of heritage private buildings in Sector 17 is taken up by the Administration. The objective of the project is to prevent further damage to the exteriors and restore the original character of these private buildings besides removing the encroachments in interiors.

Apart from this, the UT Administration is already undertaking the restoration of the facade of 30 Bays and 17 Bays building, Town Hall, Additional Town Hall and Central Library in Sector 17. The restoration work of these buildings is likely to be completed by August this year and is estimated to cost Rs 2.70 crore.

The work is also going on to restore heritage buildings in Capitol Complex, Sector 1 to its

original glory.

"The private building owners in Sector 17 had conveyed their inability to spend money on restoration of heritage buildings following which the Administration decided to execute the preservation and restoration work on its own. Till now, 10 percent of the work is completed and the entire work of phase I will be completed by the end of this year," said a senior officer of UT Administration while talking to The Pioneer.

"Initially, several SCOs in Sector 17 B and C will be covered under phase I," he said.

Sector 17, known for its lofty grey buildings now looks unkempt because of the discoloured facade over the years.

In a survey held in the past, out of 500 public or privately owned heritage buildings in Sector 17, only 23.40 percent were found to be maintaining the

original architectural building facade in Sector 17. The concrete surface texture however showed signs of weathering action, carbonation, black streaks. 49.60 percent have altered, damaged exposed concrete facade due to painted surface, 22.80 percent showed signs of weathering action carbonated or blackened surface, 0.40 percent showed signs of alteration, damage due to algae, microbial action and 3.80 percent have developed visible cracks and are structurally damaged.

Notably, the architectural controls, zoning regulations and building bylaws had been put in place, for commercial and residential buildings abutting the shopping streets wherein the entire external facades and internal planning was to compulsorily conform to the standard design provided by the city planners to maintain the original character

of the city.

However, both intermingled commercial and residential areas are today witnessing violations of these rules and regulations. The violations in Sector 17 here include coverage of balconies and courtyards, construction beyond zones areas, encroachments of public corridors, breach of frame controls, to name a few.

For restoration of heritage structures to its original glory in Chandigarh, the Administration had enlisted heritage in three categories namely heritage zones, heritage precincts and heritage buildings in the city.

The private buildings enlisted as heritage included SCOs/SCFs, City Centre Sector 17, Shop-cum-offices along Madhya Marg, Sectors 7 and 26, Shop-cum-offices along Dakshin Marg Sector 22, four private residences among others.

Govt to buy Ayurvedic medicines, processed foods

The Chhattisgarh government will buy Ayurvedic medicines, processed foods obtained from minor forest produce and herbal products made by the Chhattisgarh State Minor Forest Produce Association, it was announced on Thursday.

Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel chaired a Cabinet Meeting in the Assembly premises where the decision was taken.

In case the products are not available with the Minor Forest Produce Association, government departments can obtain clearance from the Association and buy them from the market.

Regarding the products produced by the Minor Forest Produce Association or through Public Private Partnership, the Cabinet has decided to relax the tender invitation as per the provision of the Chhattisgarh Warehousing Rules.



It was decided to set up a six-member committee under the chairmanship of the Additional Chief Secretary or Principal Secretary (Forest and Climate Change Department) to determine the selling price. The Cabinet also decided to procure kodo-kutki (minor millets) and ragi at support price in

the scheduled area of the state. Regarding the disposal of unclaimed paddy procured at support price, the Cabinet decided to dispose the 2.27 lakh tonnes of paddy remaining in the post-drought collection centre, cancel the target of depositing 1.72 lakh tonnes for custom milling and deposit an

additional 60,000 tonnes to the Chhattisgarh State Civil Supplies Corporation in the State Pool.

The Cabinet has decided to go for auction regarding 20.5 lakh tonnes of unallocated paddy. The Food Department will invite the bids. The Cabinet ratified the

decision taken by the Company's Board of Directors to shut down both the 120 MW units of the Chhattisgarh State Power Generation Co Ltd in Korba.

The Energy Department will decide on alternative use of the vacant land available as a result of the closure.

Assembly to hold 30-minute discussion on surplus paddy

Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Thursday agreed for a 30-minute discussion over surplus paddy and milled rice after the ruling and opposition benches clashed noisily on the fourth day of the Budget session in the Assembly.

BJP's Ajay Chandrakar sought to know the quantity of paddy procured till January 31, the quantity custom milled and the remaining balance. He wanted who was responsible for the rice still left.

Food Minister Amarjeet Bhagat responded that 92 lakh tonnes of paddy were procured and 32.22 lakh tonnes have been custom milled while 59.78 lakh tonnes remained. The time period to deposit



custom milled rice is September 30.

He added that in the last fiscal year, 3.44 lakh tonnes of paddy remained in stock and were kept in different centres. Last year custom milling was delayed due to Covid-19 and other factors.

Chandrakar then demanded tabling of the standard rules of milling regarding more than one year old paddy. He and the

Leader of Opposition sought details of sanction granted by the Central government with dates.

Calling it a serious issue, Baghel said the state carried out procurement at Minimum Support Price (MSP) after the Centre objected to bonus payment.

In the current year, objections were raised regarding the Rajiv Gandhi Kisan Nyay Scheme while the Centre agreed to procure 60 lakh tonnes of rice. But only 24 lakh tonnes were permitted.

Chhattisgarh will auction the balance paddy to reduce loss to the exchequer and to the farmers. He added that permission to set up an ethanol plant has not been cleared.

As commotion continued in the House, Baghel agreed to hold a 30-minute discussion.

Gauthans will be developed as Rural Industrial Parks: Baghel

Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel on Thursday transferred ₹4.94 crores into the bank accounts of 154,423 people under Godhan Nyaya Yojana and announced Gauthans will be developed as Rural Industrial Parks.

With this 14th instalment, the government has paid a total of ₹80.42 crores to those who sold cow dung. The bank transfer followed a Cabinet meeting.

Baghel said that through various activities like mushroom production, poultry farming, fisheries, goat rearing, rice mill, kodo-kutki



and lac processing in Gauthans, thousands have got employment.

To connect more women and villagers with employment-oriented activities under Godhan Nyaya Yojana, the government will develop Gauthans as Rural Industrial Parks, he said.

The Chief Minister said nearly 6 lakh quintals of

vermi-compost have been produced by women self-help groups in Gauthans. Vermicompost production will be done on a larger scale in the days to come.

Soon, vermi-compost production will reach 12 lakh quintals.

Baghel said that women self-help groups should be linked to minor forest

produce processing activities in Gauthans.

Agriculture Minister Ravindra Choubey said that multi-utility centres and CG Marts should be developed in Gauthans in all the districts to facilitate the sale of manufactured goods.

Minor forest produce processing will also be included in Gauthans, he said.

Agriculture Production Commissioner Dr. M. Geeta said women self-help groups have earned ₹10 crores from various income-oriented activities being conducted in the gauthans.

She added that the number of self-supporting Gauthans has risen from 226 to 251.

Man held for stealing cash from bank

Chhattisgarh Police on Thursday arrested a 38-year-old man for stealing ₹2.5 lakh from a cash counter at the Jai Stambh Chowk branch of a nationalized bank here.

Raipur Senior Superintendent of Police Ajay Kumar Yadav told The

Pioneer that N. Krishna Raju Reddy was a resident of Bhilai in Durg district.

On February 19, an Assistant General Manager of the bank lodged a case of theft against an unidentified person.

Based on CCTV footage, police found that the accused took away a bundle of 500 currency notes of ₹500 totaling ₹2.50 lakh from cash counter number 1.

Police recovered ₹1.50 in cash, a mobile phone and a bike (CG-07 BU 7375) used in the crime.

The accused is a habitual offender and he was jailed for stealing ornaments from a shop in Durg in 2011.

Police are investigating if he was involved in a similar cash theft at a bank in Rajnandgaon district in 2018.

Security forces demolish seven Naxalite hideouts

Security forces have destroyed seven Maoist hideouts in Abujmahad region in Chhattisgarh's Bastar division, police said on Thursday.

"In the last three days, seven Naxalite hideouts were demolished," Inspector General of Police (Bastar) Sundarraj P said.

He said the District Reserve Group (DRG), Special Task Force (STF), Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) and Border Security Force (BSF) launched operation 'Sangam' on the tri-junction of Narayanpur, Kanker and Gadchiroli districts near the Maharashtra border.

Huge quantities of arms, ammunition, camping materials and medicines were recovered from the hideouts.



These hideouts are suspected to have been occupied by senior cadres of the North Bastar and Maad Division of DKSZC (Dandakaranya Special Zonal Committee), said the officer. Although one DRG jawan was killed and another injured in the action, the security forces are believed to have inflicted serious losses to the Naxalites in the unexplored terrains of Abujmahad, he said.

Man gets 20 yrs RI for raping minor

RAIPUR: A Special Fast Track Court on Thursday awarded 20 years rigorous imprisonment to a 30-year-old man here for raping a seven-year-old girl.

Additional District and Sessions Judge Rajeev Kumar found Deepak Verma guilty, Special Public Prosecutor Morisha Naidu told The Pioneer. He was also fined ₹50,000.

The crime was committed here on June 25, 2018 when the victim was returning from a provision store. The girl shared her ordeal with her mother, who alerted the police.



Assembly updates

Opposition stages walkout over irregularities

Disappointed with the answer of the Urban Development Minister, BJP members on Thursday walked out of the Chhattisgarh Assembly on the subject of issuing tender without administrative sanction.

This happened on the fourth day of the Budget session. BJP's Ranjana Dipendra Sahu sought a date on which technical sanction was given for construction of a commercial complex at Balak Chowk in the Dhamtari Municipal Corporation limits.



Had it been completed and, if not, was tender issued for a second time? If yes, what action has been initiated against the contractor, he asked.

Minister Dr Shiv Dahariya said a technical sanction was given on January 18, 2016. Another sanction was given and work order was issued on March 7, 2019. The work was to be completed in 11 months. He said that as the earlier contractor did not complete

the work, again a technical sanction and tender were called.

Sahu asked how tender was called a year before technical sanction. Alleging irregularities, the BJP sought a probe. When the demand was not conceded, BJP members walked out in protest.

Walkout over delay in drinking water scheme

RAIPUR: BJP members walked out of the Chhattisgarh Assembly on Thursday alleging delay in implementing a drinking water scheme in Gariaband district and saying they were not satisfied with the reply of the Public Health Engineering Department Minister.

On the fourth day of the Budget session, Ajay Chandrakar, Brijmohan Agrawal, Narayan Chandel and others raised the issue of a two-year delay vis-a-vis the drinking water scheme for residents of Supabeda village in Gariaband.

Around 75 deaths have been reported from the area and villagers recently called on the District Collector seeking permission to die.

Minister Guru Rudra Kumar said the village has 1,183 residents and they are being provided water under 'Naljal' Scheme.

The government has given administrative sanction of Rs 1,278 lakh which will cover suction pumps, pipelines and tanks in nine villages. The work order was issued on October 21, 2020.

When the opposition sought to know the reason for the delay, the Minister said even after 15 years in government the BJP could not provide drinking water while the Congress government will complete the project soon.

Not satisfied with the answers, BJP members trooped out raising slogans.

Adjournment over paddy

The BJP and other opposition leaders on Thursday raised the issue of custom milling and paddy decay in the procurement centres through an adjournment motion in the Chhattisgarh Assembly. The Chair's rejection of the motion led to commotion and adjournment for five minutes.

Raising the issue, BJP's Narayan Chandel said in the current fiscal year 92 lakh tonnes of paddy was procured from farmers. There was delay in transportation and custom milling.

If adequate custom milling is not done, then losses will be higher than last year. The whole economy of the state relies on paddy and the farmers.

BJP's Saurabh Singh said even after record procurement, this year there will be record damage of paddy. Former Chief Minister Dr Raman Singh sought a White Paper.

Dharamjeet Singh (JCC-I) said paddy is lying without cover in Mungeli district. Keshav Chandra (BSP) said paddy has not been lifted even after 72 days in violation of rules.

No let up in Covid cases in Maha, 7 other States

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

There is no let up in the renewed rise in daily new cases in States like Maharashtra, Kerala, Punjab, West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Gujarat and Chhattisgarh.

A total of 16,738 new daily Covid-19 cases have been recorded in a span of 24 hours taking the total tally of active infection to 1,51,708.

The Union Health Ministry said 89.57 per cent of the new cases are from the seven states with Maharashtra continuing to top the chart at the highest daily new cases at 8,807. It is followed by Kerala with 4,106 cases while Punjab reported 558 new cases. In fact, Maharashtra reported 80 deaths, highest in two months (since December 24, when 89 deaths were reported). With this, the total cases in the State jumped to 21,21,119 and the toll touched 51,937. The Centre has already deputed high-level multi-disciplinary teams there to ascertain reasons for the surge and coordinate with the state health departments in Covid-19 control and containment measures.

The Centre has also written to states and UTs to focus on undertaking aggressive



measures to break the chain of transmission.

States and UTs have been advised to increase testing in a focussed manner in the affected districts with the appropriate split of RT-PCR and rapid antigen tests and to also ensure that all symptomatic negatives of antigen tests are compulsorily tested via RT-PCR tests.

The positive persons are to be isolated/hospitalised, all their close contacts be traced and also tested without delay. They have been advised to critically review the emerging situation on a regular basis with district officials concerned to ensure that gains made so far in Covid-19 management are not lost.

India has administered over 1.30 Crore vaccine doses so far. A total of 1,30,67,047 vaccine doses have been given through 2,77,303 Sessions, as per the provisional report till 6

The five most affected States by total cases are Maharashtra (2,121,119), Kerala (1,045,009), Karnataka (949,183), Andhra Pradesh (889,503), and Tamil Nadu (849,629)

pm on Thursday. These include 65,82,007 HCWs (75.5%) who have taken the 1st dose and 18,60,859 HCWs (63.6%) who have taken the 2nd dose, along with 46,24,181 frontline workers (FLWs) (1st dose) (45.1%). While the countrywide vaccination drive was rolled out on 16th Jan 2021

Vaccination of the FLWs started on 2nd Feb 2021. Just eight states account for more than 56 per cent of the total vaccine doses.

Constitutional institutions should work together for a strong democracy: Speaker

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla Thursday said it is important for all constitutional institutions to complement and cooperate with each other for a strong democracy. "Democracy can be strengthened only when all constitutional institutions work in tandem and cooperate with each other within their respective constitutional jurisdictions. All the institutions should complement each other," Birla said, addressing the members of the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly.

"There can be dissent during discussions but we should not reach an impasse. Our discussions should lead to the welfare of the people of the country," the Speaker added.

Birla, who is currently on a two-day visit to Meghalaya, said one of his foremost priorities in Parliament was to make women, young and newly-elected MPs aware of various parliamentary conventions and practices. "I always promote and welcome their active participation in debates and dis-

cussions that take place in the House. It is very important to ensure the capacity-building of the members to pave way for constructive debates in Parliament," he said.

The Speaker also talked about some of the new initiatives being taken in Lok Sabha to enhance the practical knowledge of the members, including briefing sessions on the bills being introduced in the lower house.

He advised that similar programmes should be organised in the legislative assemblies as well. Birla also talked about PRISM, a new service that was introduced in Parliament during the Budget Session, to provide MPs with parliamentary research and information support.

"I would like you to set up a similar modern research wing in the legislative assembly to provide round-the-clock support to the members. We will be happy to provide all possible support for setting up such a research wing," he told the MLAs.

Among facilities that were underway, he said, was the NeVA (National E Vidhan Application) that would make proceedings and debates of Parliament and State legislature available on a single platform.

NIA files chargesheet against TPC commander

The NIA on Thursday filed a chargesheet against the self-styled Zonal Commander of TPC, a Jharkhand based terrorist group of Naxal hue.

The second supplementary chargesheet was filed before the NIA special court, Ranchi against Vikas Ganju, who is known with aliases like Avinash, Dashrath Ganju and Varun Ji, is a Zonal Commander of TPC. The agency chargesheeted him under Indian Penal Code Sections relating to criminal conspiracy and extortion besides provisions of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act and Criminal Law Amendment Act.

The case was initially registered as FIR No. 157/2017 at Police Station Panki, Palamu, Jharkhand on November 23, 2017 after recovery of ₹5 lakhs cash along with arms and ammunition from Shyam Bhokta alias DC, a TPC operative.

The TPC, a break-away terrorist group of CPI (Maoist) is also an unlawful organisation proscribed by Jharkhand government under CLA Act, 1908.

vide FPOs and FFPOs by collaborating with them in a holistic manner, said Nayak.

The NCDC will provide handholding to these organizations for next five years to

help them realise a better price of their farm produce and make them self-reliant in the long term, he added.

On his part, Anbarasu welcomed the initiative saying that the collaboration will bring innumerable benefits in the region. "This will ensure employment and entrepreneurship skills among farmers and fishermen in the island. One out of seven persons is a fisherman here engaged in coastal activities like fisheries, seaweed business and coconut trade besides farming. This is a good beginning and we are looking forward to forming entities of the farmers and fishermen for their benefits besides all round development of the community."

Setting up the FPOs and FFPOs is the part of the Narendra Modi Government's

scheme of bringing more and more small and marginal farmers on a big platform as a joint entity for which budgetary support of ₹4,496 crore by 2024 has been allocated. Aim is to form and promote at least 10,000 new FPOs by that period across the States.

Currently, there are over 3,000 FPOs in the country, considered to be quite low given the fact that the total marginal and small farmers, having landholding size of up to five acres, account for over 85 per cent of total farmers in the country.

Besides, as per the part, the NCDC and Lakshadweep administration will also work together on areas such as animal husbandry, dairy, agriculture, food processing, rural finance and women issues through cooperative principles in the island.

Fishers need independent Ministry, says Rahul

Former Congress president Rahul Gandhi on Thursday said fisherfolk need an independent fisheries ministry and not just a department within a Ministry, responding to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's swipe at him.

At a public meeting in Puducherry, the Prime Minister expressed shock over Rahul Gandhi's statement last week that there was no "dedicated" fisheries ministry. At the time, BJP leaders, including Union ministers, had also taken a swipe at Gandhi.

Responding to the PM's swipe, Rahul tweeted, "Dear PM, Fisherfolk need an independent and dedicated ministry of fisheries, not just a department within a ministry." "PS-

'Hum do Humare do' obviously hurt bad," he said referring to the jibe he had used against the Government recently to allege that it is being run by Modi and his "corporate friends".

Modi, in his remarks in Puducherry, said, "Congress leaders say we will make a fisheries ministry. I was shocked. The truth is, it is the current NDA government that had made a ministry for fisheries in 2019." In 2019, the Modi Government had formed a Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying.

In a separate tweet, Rahul Gandhi also attacked the government over a media report claiming that the government has started clearing foreign direct investment proposals from China on a case-by-case basis.

Govt cannot implement farm laws as matter is with SC: Tomar

At a time when farmer unions have decided to support the Bharat Bandh called by transport and trade unions on February 26 and appealed farmers to make it success, Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar on Thursday said the Government cannot implement the farm laws as the matter is with the Supreme Court and the SC-constituted committee is yet to submit its feedback. The Minister also added that the farmer unions, which have been protesting against the farm laws for nearly three months, have not given their feedback on the centre's proposal of putting the farm laws on hold for 1.5 years.

The Minister said that the Government is fully sensitive towards farmers. "The government has held 12 rounds of talks with the farmers and they are ready to talk to farmers anytime. We have held several rounds of talks (with unions). We proposed many amendments as well as keeping the farm reform Acts on hold for 1.5 years and setting up a joint panel to find solutions. But, they have not responded to our proposals," Tomar said on the sidelines of an event on Thursday.

"We can't implement the farm laws as the matter is with Supreme Court. The Supreme Court constituted committee is yet to submit its feedback. They did not respond to the proposal. We are ready for talks whenever farmers bring their views on the government's proposal," Tomar added.

JNCASR scientists develop molecule to halt dementia

After nearly a decade of research, scientists from the Jawaharlar Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR), Bengaluru, have developed a molecule that could be a potential drug candidate to halt or cure the leading cause of dementia (70-80 per cent) worldwide. The research has been published in the journal Advanced Therapeutics.

About 5-6 per cent of individuals between the ages of 65-70 years in India suffer from Alzheimer's disease, a neuro degenerative condition which is incurable. However, a recent trend has been observed where

people in their 30s or 40s are also developing signs of Alzheimer's disease, which is a cause of worry.

In such a dismal scenario, the study by the JNCASR, an autonomous institute under the Department of Science & Technology (DST) is a ray of hope for many.

As per the study, Dr T Govindaraju, Professor, JNCASR, and his team designed and synthesised molecules which can reduce the toxicity of amyloid peptide—that accumulates in the central nervous system. "The molecule, called TGR63, can rescue neuronal cells from amyloid toxicity. We saw that the molecule helped in reducing the clumping and slowly reversing the cognitive

decline," claimed Dr Govindaraju.

He pointed out that the experiment was carried out on mice with and without Alzheimer's disease. "Mice brain affected with Alzheimer's showed a significant reduction of amyloid deposits when treated with TGR63. The mice also showed reduction in learning deficiency, memory impairment and cognitive decline as revealed by distinct behavioural tests.

These key attributes have validated the potential of TGR63 as a promising drug candidate, he said. "We are looking for pharmaceutical companies to fund our project to start clinical trials," Dr Govindaraju said.

Can't trust Pak: LoC residents

Despite facing the brunt of heavy shelling along the Line of Control in Poonch and Rajouri sectors large number of border residents living in the direct line of firing on Thursday reacted cautiously to the joint statement by the India and Pakistan army to strictly observe all agreements, understandings and ceasefire along the Line of Control and all other sectors with effect from midnight 24/25 Feb 2021.

"We have been repeatedly targeted by the roaring Pak guns in the forward areas. We want to live in peace and cultivate our fields. But due to heightened tension in the region we were not able to do so for a long time. Students in the region suffered the most due to prolonged suspension of classes due to repeated incidents of cross LoC firing, Mohd Imtiyaz of village Shahpur in Poonch said.

A local panch in the area claimed, we cannot trust Pakistan so easily. It's in the habit of pushing infiltrators via this route. Our parents suffered due to regular shelling. Now our generation is also facing the same. We regularly pray and want peace to prevail. The



reaction of border residents in the Nowshera area of Rajouri was no different. Most of the villagers engaged in the farming activity said, we always want peace to prevail and lead peaceful lives without facing the brunt of border firing. We have seen armies standing eyeball to eyeball and now we want to see our next generation to live in peace and focus on their careers.

Meanwhile, political parties in Jammu and Kashmir welcomed the agreement between armies of India and Pakistan on ceasefire along the Line of Control (LoC) and other sectors. "We welcome it and hope

the LoC. Dialogue is the only way forward if both countries want to stop the unending cycle of violence & bloodshed across the borders and J&K," Mehbooba said.

In a statement, Congress party said that it always favoured any initiatives aimed at restoration of peace on the borders and LOC and ensuring safety of our residents and jawans in Jammu and Kashmir but questioned whether the infiltration and cross border terrorism has been stopped by Pakistan. Reacting to the latest developments, JKPC Chief G A Mir Thursday questioned the Modi government for its flip flop policy as it had been stating that the talks and terrorism / cross border firing can't go together.

BJP had been always saying that the no talks are possible with Pakistan till it stops cross border terrorism and infiltration. It had been targeting the previous UPA government for track two diplomacy and dialogue on the ground that no talks should be held till Pakistan stops cross border Terrorism and firing. It always advocated tough posturing with Pakistan by claiming that you need a 56" chest to deal with Pakistan.

5 killed in blast in fireworks factory in Tamil Nadu

Five people were killed and six injured in an explosion at a fireworks factory near Sivakasi in the district on Thursday, police said.

More than ten sheds where chemicals had been stored were razed to the ground in the mishap, the second such incident this month in a cracker manufacturing unit in this region, the country's fireworks hub.

Fire and rescue service teams battled the blaze in the unit at Kalayar Kurichi, police said, adding the injured were rushed to hospitals.

The cause of the explosion was not known immediately.

More than 20 people had died and around 30 injured in a major explosion in a fireworks unit at Achankulam village near Sattur in this district on February 2.

Go for BEST, reject Congress' feudal culture: PM in Puducherry

Virtually launching BJP's campaign for upcoming Assembly elections in Puducherry, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday urged people to vote for NDA's good governance agenda and reject anti-development forces.

Addressing a party rally in the union territory, a day after Centre recommending imposition of President's Rule following collapse of the Congress Government, the Prime Minister appealed to the people to bring to power a government that will restore Puducherry's glory.

He said NDA wants to make Puducherry BEST -- B for business hub, E for education, S for spiritual hub and T for tourism hub. While the Congress "are gold, silver and bronze medal winners in telling lies" and neither work nor allow others to work.

Launching a scathing attack on the Congress party for failing to live up to people's expectations, he said: "In 2016 Puducherry did not get a people's government. They got a government that was busy serving Congress high command in

Delhi. Their priorities were different."

Attacking former Chief Minister V. Narayanasamy, Modi said: "Your former chief minister was an expert at lifting slippers of his top party leaders but he did not have interest to lift people out of poverty."

The Prime Minister said Puducherry deserve a government whose high command are people of Puducherry and not a small group of Congress leaders sitting in Delhi. "NDA assures the people of Puducherry that the next government will be people-powered government."

Modi claimed that the enthusiasm and energy he was seeing at the rally was a harbinger of the change in political direction of the state.

"I am seeing great happiness -- this joy for two reasons. One there are many developments works which were inaugurated today and second people of Puducherry are celebrating freedom from misgovernance of Congress," he said.

He alleged that Congress government damaged every sector of economy. "Congress does not believe in working for

people I can understand that but what I can't understand is why Congress does not want others to work for people," he said alleging that the there was non-cooperation from Congress government.

Modi also mentioned about Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's recent visit to Puducherry during which then Chief Minister Narayanasamy gave wrong translation of a woman who was complaining about the government.

"Instead of telling truth to the nation, the chief minister gave wrong translation. He lied to people and his own leader. Can a party whose culture based on lies ever serve the people," he asked.

He also slammed Congress for not holding panchayat elections in Puducherry. He said while Congress leave no opportunity to call others anti-democratic but they need to look at themselves in mirrors. He said people will punish anti-democratic mindset of Congress.

He said while colonial rulers had the policy of divide and rule, Congress divide, lie and rule. "They are gold, silver and bronze medal winners in telling lies," the PM said.

N-E will be India's growth hub: Shah

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Thursday said Prime Minister Narendra Modi has identified the Northeast region as India's 'Growth Hub'.

Addressing a gathering in Nagaon district's Batadrava Than, Shah said the Modi government has already started work to make the region as the growth engine of India.

"To take the Northeast development in a mission mode, the Prime Minister had visited the region 35 times in the past five years. The Congress leaders and ministers visited Assam only during the election time," the senior BJP leader said.

"Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's stewardship, a new era of development has started in Assam and the Northeast region. Entire Northeast region is transforming. Northeast India will emerge as the highest contributor in the GDP of India," said Shah.

Urging the people to reinstall the BJP government for the second time, Shah promised that his party's vision is to make Assam an infiltration free, flood free, corruption free, violence free, agitation free and number one state in India. "A satellite based survey has been conducted and plans are afoot to permanently

resolve the flood problem and to undertake many projects to develop tourism and other infrastructures," he said.

The Batadrava Than in central Assam's Nagaon district is the birthplace of social reformer Mahapurush Srimanta Sankaradeva, who was a 15th-16th century Assamese saint, scholar, poet, playwright, social-religious reformer and a figure of importance in Assam's cultural and religious history.

Shah on Thursday launched the work of a state-funded Rs 188-crore project for the beautification of Batadrava Than.

Saying that the Centre and state double engine governments of the BJP have undertaken a large number of steps for the all round development of Assam and protection of Assamese culture and traditions. He said the NDA government has awarded late famous singer and composer Bhupen Hazarika with Bharat Ratna; and the Padma Bhushan award posthumously to former Assam Chief Minister and Congress leader Tarun Gogoi.

Former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh represented Assam, the Congress ruled Assam for 15 years (2001-2016) but did nothing for the betterment of Assam and its people. "The BJP-led NDA gov-

ernment has constructed over 20,000 km road, bridges, airports, railway projects, approved a lot of gas and oil based projects, mega health institutions including AIIMS and many educational institutions," he pointed out.

The Home Minister said that the BJP government in Assam, to protect and promote the traditions and culture of Assam had provided Rs 2.5 lakh each to 8,000 'Namghars' (traditional Vaishnavite monasteries of Assam) under the Assam 'Darshan' programme.

"Namghars", literally meaning Prayer House, introduced by Srimanta Sankaradeva, are places for congregational worship associated with the entire Assamese community and the Ekasarana sect of Hinduism, in particular, which is native to Assam.

Assam Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal, state's Finance, Education and Health Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma also addressed the gatherings.

Later in the day, Shah will visit the hill district of Karbi Anglong where he will address another public meeting at Dengaon and is expected to meet surrendered extremists.

Earlier, Shah visited Assam on February 11 and January 23, and addressed several public rallies.

'Without arms, violence, Modi Govt fulfilling all demands of North-East'

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Thursday said that without peace in northeast no development is possible and without arms and violence, the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led Government has been fulfilling all demands and requirements.

Addressing an impressive gathering in the hill district of central Assam's Karbi Anglong, Shah said that the Union and Assam government had already successfully convinced hundreds of extremists belonging to nine outlawed outfits to shun violence and just on Tuesday 1,040 more terrorists of five outfits led by wanted terrorist leader Ingti Kathar Songbigit surrendered to the Assam Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal.

"The tribal guerrillas have deposited 338 sophisticated arms including AK series rifles, LMGs, rocket launchers and over 11,000 various types of ammunition," the home minister said, ensuring the surrendered militants to fulfil the promises given to them by the

Assam government within one year.

"If you want education, health and other sectors to develop then peace is the foremost condition. Development cannot happen at the cost of weapons. AWe have successfully signed agreements with Bodoland based militants, resolving decades old Reang ethnic community problems in Tripura. Bring BJP once again to power in Assam, Karbi Anglong would become the most developed region," Shah said.

While praising the surrendered extremists for their decision to lay down arms, who assembled in the gatherings, the home minister and senior Bharatiya Janata Party leader said: "You have the same rights in India as I am enjoying. Assam would be most developed state if you voted BJP for the second time."

Hitting out at Congress, he said the party (Congress) ruled Assam for so many years but there was no development and when the BJP came to power in Assam in 2017, it has progressed.

Kerala tense following murder of RSS leader

The dawn-to-dusk hartal called by Sangh Parivar in Kerala's Alappuzha district on Thursday turned out to be total with most of the shops and business establishments remaining shut down and vehicles staying off the roads. The hartal call was to condemn the murder of 22-year-old Nandhu R Krishna, a district level RSS leader late Wednesday night. Two RSS activists who were injured seriously in the attack have been admitted to hospital.

Activists of SDPI, an Islamic extremist outfit, hacked to death in a gruesome manner Nandhu around 9 pm by Wednesday night. The murder of Nandhu is believed to be the continuation of the tension prevailing in the region between Sangh Parivar and SDPI following the visit of Yogi Adityanath, chief minister of Uttar Pradesh to Kasaragod last week.

Leaders of the SDPI, known as Sudapis, had reportedly delivered provocative speeches during a public meeting and this set off a chain reaction which culminated in the hacking of Nandhu.

No let up in spurt of cases in Maha, records 8,702 cases, 56 people die

With no let up in the continued increase in the number of Covid-19 infections, Maharashtra shot past 8700 cases for the second consecutive day to register 8,702 fresh cases on Thursday, while 56 people succumbed to the pandemic in various parts of the state.

A day after the state registered 8807 cases which was incidentally the second highest number of cases recorded in 129 days - after 9060 cases witnessed on October 18 last year, Thursday's infection tally of 8702 came close to the one registered on Wednesday.

However, the daily Covid-19 toll came down from 80 on Wednesday to 56 on Thursday. With 8702 new cases, the total number of infections jumped from 21,21,119 to 21,29,821. Similarly, with 56 new deaths, the total number of deaths rose from 51,937 to 51,993.

As 3,744 patients were discharged from the hospitals across the state after full recovery, the total number of people discharged from the hospitals since the second week of March last year went up to 20,12,367. The recovery rate in the state

dropped marginally from 94.70 per cent to 94.49 per cent.

With five fresh deaths, the Covid-19 toll in Mumbai rose from 11,458 to 11,463, while the infected cases went up by 1145 to trigger a jump in the infections from 3,21,699 to 3,22,844.

Meanwhile, the number of "active cases" total cases in the state went up from 59,358 to 64,260. The fatality rate in the state dropped from 2.45 per cent at 2.44 per cent.

Pune district, which continued to be the worst-affected city-district in Maharashtra, saw the total number of cases increase from 4,03,782 to 4,05,307, while the total number of deaths in Pune went up from 8,044 to 8,048.

Thane district remained in the third spot - after Pune and Mumbai - after the total number of infections rose from 2,77,580 to 2,78,288 while the total deaths climbed from 5,795 to 5,803.

Of the 1,59,41,773 samples sent to laboratories, 21,21,119 have tested positive (13.31 per cent) for COVID-19 until Thursday.

Currently, 2,95,578 people are in home quarantine while 2,446 people are in institutional quarantine.

Tejashwi raises Sitamarhi encounter in Assembly, hits out at Government

The Bihar Government is on the backfoot after an encounter with the liquor mafia in Sitamarhi district on Wednesday claimed the life of a sub-inspector while a guard sustained grievous injuries.

Leader of Opposition and RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav raised this incident in the

Vidhan Sabha on Thursday. He said that the law and order situation in Bihar is in a bad shape. This is the reason why police officers are getting killed in broad daylight.

"Transfers and postings would be done for only those police officers who used to give 'RCP tax' (Bribe) to top bosses in the Nitish Kumar government," Tejashwi said.

Kerala caught between devil and deep sea?

Allegations of massive corruption and illegal sale of deep sea fishing rights to a dubious firm from the United States have taken whatever sheen remained on the CPI(M)-led Pinarayi Vijayan Government in Kerala, says Oommen Chandi, former Chief Minister of Kerala.

Though Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan and Fisheries Minister J Mercykutty claimed that the MoU with the US company for deep sea fishing off Kerala Coast was signed without the concurrence of the Kerala Government, neither the fishermen nor the general public are willing to believe the argument.

"The deal was signed by the State-owned Kerala State Industrial development Corporation and Kerala Inland Navigation Corporation with the US company which itself has dubious track records. It is certain that this is not a clean and transparent deal," said Hari S Kartha, widely respected political commentator in the State.

According to Kartha, the CPI(M) is fighting a losing battle against the UDF. "The Pinarayi Vijayan government had squandered all the good will it had among the people when it assumed office in 2016. Tuesday's UDF rally at Thiruvananthapuram should be seen in this context," he said. Oommen Chandi who presided over the meeting

which also saw the participation of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, turned out to be a runaway success, he said. "Chandi was the unquestioned star of the show and this is a warning signal to the LDF," said Kartha.

The LDF Government is in a fire-fighting mode and is issuing advertisements in all newspapers and TV channels claiming that "Kerala witnessed tremendous growth in number of industries in the past four and a half years". "Kerala has become a role model of progress. One of the departments that has added feather in its growth cap is the industries department," claims E P Jayarajan, minister of industries.

The industries department claims that NITI Aayog's India Innovation Index has ranked Kerala as one of the most investment friendly States in India. Vijayan and the CPI(M) had lambasted the Centre for disbanding the Planning Commission of India and introducing the NITI Aayog.

The NITI Aayog's India Innovation Index says the Ease of Doing Business (EDB) in Kerala is 3.57 while that of neighbouring Tamil Nadu and Karnataka are 53.57 and 42.86 respectively. Andhra Pradesh tops the Index with a score of 100. The EDB is the yardstick which entrepreneurs and investors use to measure the investment and industrial climate of a State or a country. The last four years saw four

Didi protests petro price hike, rides e-scooty to office

The poll-bound politics of Bengal rode the e-wheels with Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Thursday riding a too-and-fro to State Secretariat Nabanna on an electronic scooty to drive home the point on scorching fuel prices.

A day after hurling "Dangabaj" (rioter) and "Doitya" (Demon) abuses on Prime Minister Narendra Modi the Chief Minister on Thursday rode a battery-driven scooty instead of the usual Santro car that she uses to travel 8 km from her house at Kalighat to Nabanna.

While State Minister Firhad Hakim rode her to the secretariat in the morning, in the evening the Chief Minister rode back on her own with the security network in pursuit. In her trademark white cotton sari, Banerjee put on a helmet and mask during the ride which was trailed by a group of other people from the ruling Trinamool Congress.

The entire ride was telecast through Facebook Live. Later even as the Chief Minister addressed the media, seated on the battery-operated scooter she attacked the Prime Minister saying, "this was a ride taken to remind Modi of his duties towards the common man whose lives he has made miserable by effecting massive rise

in petro prices."

Ridiculing the Prime Minister for giving free LPG gas connection and then charging Rs 800 per cylinder, Banerjee said "think about a family that needs two gases per month spending Rs 1,600 on that account ... then how will that family buy foods and spend on education and health."

At a time "when the price of crude has come down to half this Government has effected a 100 per cent rise in the price of cooking gas... It sold for Rs 400 with subsidy then and it is selling for Rs 800 now after Modi removed that subsidy that was a dire necessity for the people ... even yesterday it was increased by Rs 25," Banerjee said, adding how "even the subsidy on kerosene has been taken away."

She asked, "what the 2 crore people of my State who use kerosene oil will do? About 20 crore people of India survive on kerosene oil. They cannot buy gas for Rs 800, they cannot get subsidy on kerosene ... then what will they eat," demanding an immediate rollback on fuel prices.

"I want Modi jii either to tack back the prices or go back from power," Banerjee said adding she would continue her agitation in Bengal and would appeal to the opposition ruled states to do the same. "I will request Uddhav Thackeray,

MK Stalin, Kerala, Punjab, Rajasthan and all other Governments to take up the matter in a coordinated manner," Banerjee said.

"Modi is selling the country. This government is anti-people, anti-women, anti-farmer, and anti-young generation. We want this government to go," the Chief Minister said.

Attacking the Prime Minister for allowing a cricket stadium in Gujarat to be named after him, Banerjee said "this is height of dictatorship where the President of India is made to inaugurate a stadium named after the Prime Minister."

In an apparent reference to how the two ends of the stadium was named after two top industrialists of the country Banerjee, said "it is like a complete circle of events where there will be only 'Hum do ... humare do' apparently indicating at the Prime Minister, Home Minister Amit Shah and the two industrialists.

However, lampooning Banerjee for making the people's cause an election issue, Congress Lok Sabha leader said "she is making it an election publicity stunt instead of cutting taxes on her own end ... Why does she not lift her own taxes ... the Chhattisgarh Government has done it by reducing Rs 12 on fuel prices."



Slip of the tongue?

Rahul's remarks in Kerala, if made off the cuff, should not lead to a 'divisive politics' slugfest

Whether it was the heat of the moment or well-considered action, only the Gandhian would know. But the bullet has been fired and now it is for Rahul and the Congress to bear the recoil. At a recent rally in Kerala, Rahul said: "For the first 15 years, I was a Member of Parliament from the North, so I had got used to a different type of politics. For me, coming to Kerala was very refreshing because suddenly I found that people (here) are interested in issues, and not just superficially but in detail." Whether it will reap dividends or prove counterproductive to the 'Grand Old Party' in the forthcoming Assembly elections is best left to the wisdom of voters but Rahul's latest statement has provided the BJP with fresh fodder to attack the Congress. To be fair, Rahul is not



known for making statements that reek of divisive politics: He is straightforward, to the point and plain, and this is what makes him vulnerable. His statements often lend themselves to the creation of memes, courtesy Information Technology (IT) cells affiliated to other political parties who strive hard to prove that Rahul doesn't have the "potential" to be a leader, forget about becoming the Prime Minister in future. However, if the statement was made after due consideration, it's probably time for him to think about changing his advisors. What he said, could still have been conveyed without generating a controversy had he been a little more careful with his choice of words.

On the face of it, there is nothing inappropriate in the statement unless implied meanings are derived from it. But such derivations are common in politics and if Rahul is ignorant of it, it's his fault. Going by the adage that "politics is all about opportunity", senior BJP leaders jumped at the chance and accused the Congress leader of indulging in divisive politics for gains in the Kerala elections. In a country where leaders regularly stoop to new lows and then get away by claiming that they didn't actually mean what they said, Rahul's comment is nothing to make such a hullabaloo about. Our heads still drop in shame when we are reminded of remarks like "khaki underwear" by Azam Khan or when Mulayam Singh Yadav justified rape, saying "Boys err at times, wrong to hang rapists", or even Lalu Prasad's boastful remark that "Bihar's roads would be made like the cheeks of Hema Malini". Now, Rahul has cancelled his Left-Congress joint rally in Bengal, apparently to focus more on Kerala. It could be that the southern State seems more promising to him since the Congress' prospects are rather bleak in West Bengal where the fight is directly between the TMC and the BJP. Well, while Rahul is caught in a storm, the Congress old guard have come up with some sound advice, with Kapil Sibal saying the "wisdom of the electors" should be respected for they know "who to vote for and why". With leaders of such acumen, balance and maturity still serving the party, one wonders why Rahul doesn't seek their advice before making such foot-in-the-mouth remarks. Could it be something to do with the internal fault lines? Let's leave it for the Congress to decide.

Blood on hands

Over 6,500 migrants, including 2,711 Indians, have died working on Qatar's World Cup-related projects

It's called "The beautiful game". The loftiest event of the sport, known as the World Cup, garners the maximum number of viewers in any discipline of any sporting contest across the globe. The "greatest spectacle on Earth" involves glamour, charisma, passion, super-human athleticism, national pride and, certainly not the least, zillions of dollars for the host country as well as for the Zurich-headquartered Federation of International Football Association (FIFA) in television broadcast and other rights. The FIFA World Cup taxes the host nation a lot in terms of manpower, infrastructure and other facilities, but the monetary returns far outweigh the cost input and the moolah raked in is a purse bigger than what you'd see from any other event, even the Olympics. And Qatar is the proud host of the next edition of the World Cup in November 2022. But behind all the glitz and razzmatazz of the shiny stadia and the spruced setup in the Persian Gulf nation, is a sordid tale of hardships, torture and human rights abuse, ending in death. According to *The Guardian*, thousands of migrant workers have died in Qatar since it was unexpectedly chosen as the host for the extravaganza in December 2010.

More than 6,500 migrant labourers from five South Asian countries — India, Pakistan, Nepal, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka have died, on an average of 12 deaths each week, according to the British daily. While 2,711 of those who died hailed from India, Nepali workers accounted for 1,641 deaths, followed by Bangladesh at more than 1,000 and Pakistan 824. With inconsistent and imprecise records, it is difficult to assess the exact causes for the deaths but official records range from "blunt trauma" to "asphyxia" and "hanging", though the most common is "natural death". The actual toll is likely to be significantly higher given that the analysis did not include deaths from other countries known to send large numbers of workers to Qatar, such as Kenya and the Philippines. It is likely that a significant number of the total deaths occurred on projects related to the World Cup as Qatar has undertaken a massive construction programme to prepare for the tournament, including building seven stadiums, a new airport as well as broad additions to its public transportation network. It's time for the Indian Government, as well as the United Nations Human Rights Council, to finally take cognisance of the pitiable working and dwelling conditions of migrant workers in Qatar and censure it severely.

West Bengal and Bangladesh

There has been a major change in people's thinking ahead of State poll; even the most secular of them fear that Bengal might become another Bangladesh





As lucidly brought out by Timur Kuran, a Turkish American economist who teaches at the Duke University, the practice of Islam inhibits business growth and, therefore, does not enable economic progress or development. The prohibition of usury is an example. This explains why Islamic societies have not been economically productive. Therefore, they had to become adept at the conquest of other lands in search of resources.

Bangladesh has an added handicap. For centuries, the Bengali elite was more land-owning than business-running. The Bangladeshi culture took its cue from the Bengali elite. Islam is a comprehensive prescription for living, including politics, with the *Quran* as the ultimate reference point. No Muslim ruler could deviate from that path. Ideally, *jamhuriyat* (consensus) was the solution. Monarchy, autocracy and oligarchy were the only alternatives, which left democracy no space.

Sheikh Hasina Wazed somehow fights elections. She has won four terms in all, is relatively secular and grateful to India for the freedom of Bangladesh. Her predecessor, Begum Khaleda Zia, was not. Khaleda's husband Ziaur Rahman was almost pro-Pakistani, being a Muslim *ashraf* (a descendant of Prophet Muhammad). But what after Hasina Wazed retires or relinquishes power? Would not there be a change in the country's foreign policy, especially *vis-à-vis* India?

It is uncanny that the Bengali Hindu elite founded a Hindu political ideology. Raj Narain Bose is reputed to have coined the term "Hindutva", or at least used it for the first time in 1863. He was the grandfather of Yogi Aurobindo Ghosh. The Hindu Anushilan Samiti was founded and functioned only in Bengal, with even the great poet Rabindranath Tagore being its leading light. The movement against the partition of Bengal in 1905 was largely led by Yogi Aurobindo and actively supported by Tagore. The Bengal Renaissance was a Hindu phenomenon.



With the annulment of the partition of Bengal by Emperor George V in 1911 at the Delhi Durbar, the Hindu punch softened with the idea of having Hindu-Muslim cordiality. That was the inauguration of so-called secularism in Bengal. The Bengali elite began regretting their conduct towards Muslims. Say, inviting a Muslim co-villager to a wedding dinner, making him sit separately to eat and then expecting him to carry his *thali* to clean. This is just one example.

With the rise of Netaji Subhas, the Hindu-Muslim cordiality tended towards friendship. A moderate leader, Fazlur Rahman of the Krishak Party, became the Premier of Bengal; this secular trend continued. By early 1947, Netaji's elder brother Sarat Bose, Fazlur Rahman and Sir Abdul Rahim were discussing the prospects of a third dominion, namely, undivided Bengal in addition to Hindustan and Pakistan.

After Independence, the Nehruvian ethos and the appeasement of Muslims for their votes inflated this trend. The Partition, which displaced many Hindus, did not lead to any real antagonism against Muslims in Bengal in its immediate aftermath as well as later. So much so that being associ-

ated with the RSS, the Hindu Mahasabha or the Jana Sangh became infra dig. The Hindu political movement could not throw up a popular leader after Syama Prasad Mookerjee died mysteriously in Kashmir. Jana Sangh leader Haripada Bharati was respected but without mass appeal. The secular show persisted and infiltrators from Bangladesh were encouraged for their votes.

Yet, the Islamist penny dropped at last in the Bengali Hindu's mind. Clearly a revolutionary change is taking place that may well have a reaction across the border in Bangladesh. There has been a cataclysmic change in the thinking of people in West Bengal with the approaching Assembly elections. It is truly a metamorphosis because, for decades, West Bengal has both resisted the domination of what the *bhadralok* would call a "Hindi heartland party" and has prided itself on its avowedly secular outlook; the Bengali identity has been preponderant over the religious one.

However, the incessant mollicoddling of the religious minority and even the most radical jihadist elements has slowly but surely brought on an about-turn in the Bengali mind. To the extent that even the most

secular among them have begun to fear that their State might become another Bangladesh. The first major sign of West Bengal's changing political mood was the 2019 Lok Sabha election in which the BJP won 18 out of 42 parliamentary seats. The rapidly shifting scenario with the approach of the 2021 Assembly election is the beginning of a new chapter in West Bengal's political journey, one that will have implications beyond the State.

West Bengal is very much in the news, especially because of the impending Assembly elections. The country is witnessing an acrimonious tussle where the ruling Trinamool Congress' incumbent Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee is fighting to save her Government in the face of a determined assault by the BJP. The remarkable drama of the West Bengal elections is the by-now-discernible wave of discontent against Mamata — sitting Ministers and political heavyweights do not otherwise quit on poll eve to join the Opposition. But more significant is the change taking place in the Bengali psyche. There is growing willingness to be more integrally an arm of Bharat.

COVID LESSONS FOR ENTREPRENEURS

It's vital to be calm, think rationally and make decisions that affect your work environment positively

The year 2020, and the Coronavirus outbreak that dominated it, set everyone back, whether it was work or life. However, the contagion's economic impact was felt more than the social one. The financial implications of the pandemic had everyone in a tizzy, confused and thinking, will I make it? Will I survive? It took a toll on the global economy, businesses, work, personal affairs at home and made everyone question and rethink their priorities and then put them in survival mode. One of the key takeaways from the outbreak, especially for entrepreneurs leading organisations was: Invest in your mental health. That is and should be a priority. If you have peace of mind, in spite of everything else falling, crumbling around you, half the battle is won. It's important to be calm, think rationally and make decisions that affect your health and your work environment in a positive way.

The healthcare sector was overwhelmed when the pandemic hit the country. Doctors and nurses were overworked as was the other hospital staff. People were in a state of panic. However, there is no overcoming something if you are in a constant state of flux. This is especially true of leaders tasked with guiding an organisation. They have to come to grips with the reality that the pandemic will stay for a long time and the only way to work and move forward is to be transparent with staff, hear them out, value their inputs and look after them.

Should the global debt pandemic worry us?

As long as primary Budget deficits are not too large, the main problem is to stabilise public debt, independent of the size of the economy so that it may not go beyond control

The previous decade saw the fastest increase in debt in emerging economies in the last 50 years. The IMF estimated that global public debt at the end of 2020 would touch 98 per cent of the GDP, and India's gross Government debt would be at 90 per cent of the GDP. According to the IMF's *Fiscal Monitor*, the debt-to-GDP ratio exceeds 100 per cent in most OECD countries and close to 100 per cent in emerging ones. Among the major economies, only China (66.5 per cent), Australia (70 per cent) and Germany (72 per cent) have fared better. The problem economies of Italy and Greece have seen debt levels rising to 158 per cent and 200 per cent of the GDP, respectively, while Japan's debt is 264 per cent. From 2021 onwards, global debt will rise higher than in the pre-COVID times. A credible medium-term fiscal framework is essential to combat rising debt, but with the pandemic still out of control, additional revenue mobilisation necessary for public spending on health and infrastructure is now more difficult than ever before in most developing countries. The saving grace is that borrowing is now cheap, thanks to the interest rates falling to exceptionally low levels and is expected to remain lower than the growth rates in most countries. According to S&P Global, in 2023, growth will outpace interest rates not only in all rich countries, but also in 53 out of 60 emerging economies. The "growth-corrected interest rate", the differential between interest and nominal growth rates, will be -3.6 per cent in India, -6.5 per cent in China and -33.8 per cent in Argentina.

This legitimately raises the question, should emerging economies also rethink their fiscal limits? *The Economist* quoted India's budgeted fiscal deficit of 9.5 per cent of the GDP this fiscal year with no road map to bring it below the three per cent limit prescribed by the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management Act, while it noted that the latest *Economic Survey* had also highlighted that India's interest rate has been below its growth rate "by norm, not by exception", and its assertion that higher debt and fiscal spending during an economic crisis should not cause unnecessary worries. But Fitch Ratings, noted that in the last decade, the average interest rate had fallen from four per cent to two per cent in developed economies, while across emerging markets, it had increased from 4.3-5.1 per cent. Thus the benefits of lower rates are mostly available to rich nations.

The classical Dornar Model lays down two conditions for sustainability of Government debt: First, the nominal growth rate should exceed the interest rate on public debt and, second, the primary account of the Government, which means taking out the interest payment, should not have any deficit. If both conditions are satisfied, the debt stock in GDP will decrease fast, and even if the primary account has a deficit, it will ultimately converge to a sustainable level. But if the growth rate lags behind the interest rate, then public debt will increase indefinitely to be unsustainable. Thus public debt can stabilise at a higher level but this would render a country vulnerable to economic shocks. However, since this model does not consider the interdependencies existing between the interest rate, the structure of public spending, the degree of public indebtedness and the growth rate which influence each other, economists Hamilton and Flavin suggested another model. According to it, the inter-temporal Budget constraint must be satisfied to make the debt

stock sustainable, which requires the present value of future primary surpluses to cover the size of the current public debt. The uncertainty of future values of projections, interest rates and inflation remains the weakness of this model, but whatever model is used, increasing public debt does not necessarily imply its unsustainability, especially when a country needs additional finance to carry out structural forms or for making capital investments on infrastructure.

As long as primary Budget deficits are not too large, the main problem is to stabilise public debt, independent of the size of the economy so that it may not go beyond control. This is simple budgetary arithmetic. If the debt was stable at 60 per cent of the GDP with a primary deficit of three per cent, to stabilise it at 80 per cent would require the primary deficit to be limited to four per cent. *The Economic Survey* points out that GDP growth in India has always exceeded interest rates in the last 25 years, though the primary account has often been in deficit, but less than the maximum limit defined by the debt sustainability equations. The survey concludes that even in the worst case scenario, with real growth being only four per cent for the next 10 years and high primary deficits 6.8 per cent of the GDP (Centre plus States), five per cent inflation and a nominal interest rate of six per cent, public debt will still be sustainable. This scenario is not peculiar to India. The IMF says that emerging economies have experienced growth rates exceeding interest rates 75 per cent of the time. Of course, there is an element of risk in

case of high prevalence of external debt in the overall debt portfolio because if the exchange rate weakens, the debt-to-GDP ratio will rise sharply even if the interest rate remains modest. But for India, this risk is minimal as external debt constitutes only about six per cent of our total liabilities (₹5.85 lakh crore in 2019-20).

Government debt amounted to 73.8 per cent of the GDP in 2019-20, before the pandemic pushed it much higher. As per the road map prescribed by the 15th Finance Commission, India's debt should decline marginally from 89.8 per cent to 85.7 per cent of the GDP over 2020-26, but the decline will practically take place in the last three years. Thus we need to stabilise our debt around that level provided these projections hold. This may not be the case as additional spending will be required on health and infrastructure.

But the moot question is whether the high debt level is desirable even if it is sustainable, as public borrowing generally crowds out private investment and hurts the economy. Perhaps the answer lies in how the borrowed funds are used. If the Government spends on investment, like the 26 per cent increase in capital spending budgeted for the next fiscal, this risk would be less, especially when the economy is operating below capacity as is the case now; public spending can then bring in additional private investment by improving incomes and profitability.

However, this is not the first time a debt pandemic has hit the world and there were three earlier waves of debt

accumulation during 1970-89, 1990-2001 and 2002-09, all of which began during periods of low real interest rates and easy access to borrowing from the financial markets. Each caused global recessions in 1982, 1991 and 2009 and economic downturns in 1998 and 2001, and were followed by structural reforms designed to lower vulnerabilities, with greater reserve accumulation and strengthening of policy frameworks. Controls like inflation targeting, fiscal rules and more robust financial sector supervision became the norm.

We are now riding the crest of the fourth wave that began in 2010 but peaked during the pandemic with the slowing of economic growth in most countries. The conditions were remarkably similar to those after the 2008 meltdown, when interest rates were low and access to financial markets for capital was easy due to the banks having extended their outreach remarkably. As the pandemic now tests the resilience of economies, a global recession which was already raging, is now pushing the world into a deep debt crisis, which marked the end of each previous wave. Like in the case of previous waves, now also deeper structural reforms are called for. In the Indian context, this will mean many more reforms of the factor markets, along with reform of agriculture and financial sectors while strengthening the overall regulatory mechanisms. Appropriate policy choices are crucial because once recovery gets underway, only reforms and the accompanying institutional mechanisms can help restore our fiscal and debt sustainability.

India needs a standard metric for the social cost of GHG

We must also develop a metric for quantifying the social cost of other components so that the impact of local air pollution, too, can be monetised for policy formulation

Actions on the climate change front are again in the news in the US after President Joe Biden took charge. One of his first executive orders pertained to reassembling a federal, cross-Government team to figure out the "social cost of carbon."

So, what is the social cost of carbon (SCC) or of Green House Gases (GHG)? SCC is the present value of future harm caused by an incremental ton of carbon dioxide emissions.

It is difficult to estimate SCC because carbon emissions, climate change, and economic harm are related through complex processes that are not fully understood. Additionally, the rate at which to discount future harm is contentious and critical to the magnitude of the present value.

As per the Interagency Working Group on Social Cost of Carbon, the US Government's technical support document 2010: "The SCC is an estimate of the monetised damages associated with an incremental increase in carbon emissions in a given year. It is intended to include (but is not limited to) changes in net agricultural productivity, human health, property damages from increased flood risk and the value of ecosystem services due to climate change."

It is a well-established fact that consequent to climate change, countries face a slew of adverse impacts; damages that are not adequately quantified while assessing these impacts. Developing economies like India are going to bear an unduly larger share of such

impacts. An analysis of the *Climate Risk Index (CRI)*, 2021, shows India to be among the top 10 most affected countries in 2019 on account of climate change-induced extreme weather events.

India's annual monsoon season continued for a month longer than usual. From June to the end of September 2019, 110 per cent of the normal rainfall occurred, a record since 1994.

According to the CRI, the floods caused by the heavy rains were responsible for 1,800 deaths across 14 States and led to the displacement of 1.8 million people. Overall, 11.8 million people were affected by the intense monsoon season with the economic damage estimated to be \$10 billion.



Furthermore, with a total of eight tropical cyclones, 2019 was one of the most active Northern Indian Ocean cyclone seasons on record. Six of the eight cyclones intensified to become "very severe."

The worst was Cyclone Fani that occurred in May 2019 and impacted a total of 28 million people, killing nearly 90 people in India and

Bangladesh and causing economic losses of \$8.1 billion. Then, there are other consequences in terms of impacts on human health and on food security, to name a few.

The relation between fossil fuels and climate change, too, is now accepted beyond any doubt. However, while carrying out the cost-benefit analysis of different options to replace fossil fuels, these damages — also known as "externalities" — are either not taken into account or remain fuzzy. And that is where a tool like the SCC may help.

As per the Institute for Policy Integrity, the SCC is "a metric designed to quantify and monetise climate damages, representing the net economic cost of carbon dioxide emissions."

In a country like ours that is trying to transition to

clean energy through its ambitious Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) in terms of emission-intensity reductions and quantum increase in non-fossil electricity; it is imperative that policymaking and regulatory frameworks are informed by scientific evidence.

This, in turn, demands a methodology to quantify the impacts that are based on verifiable numbers and are standardised across sectors. But even more importantly, it is developed in an academically rigorous, transparent and peer-reviewed process so as to have universal acceptability.

And that is where an inter-agency or an inter-ministerial approach helps in forging a joint ownership. Given that this is not a one-time exercise, a formal mech-

anism needs to be put in place.

The Apex Committee for Implementation of Paris Agreement (AIPA) constituted by the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Change (MoEFCC) may very well provide such a unified platform. The mechanism must also provide for engaging with the public and other stakeholders in an ongoing fashion.

Going forward, we should aim at not only developing a metric for quantifying the social cost of GHG but also of other components so that the impact of local air pollution, too, can be holistically monetised from a policy formulation perspective.

It is time that such complex matters attract a more science-based approach, thereby obviating any kind of biases.

Junta supporters attack anti-coup demonstrators

Yangon: Supporters of Myanmar's junta attacked protesters demanding the end to the military government that took power in a coup, using slingshots, iron rods and knives Thursday to injure several of the demonstrators.

The violence complicates an already intractable standoff between the military and a protest movement that has been staging large rallies daily to demand that Aung San Suu Kyi's elected government be restored to power. She and other politicians were ousted and arrested on February 1 in a takeover that shocked the international community and reversed years of slow progress toward democracy.

Facebook, meanwhile, announced that it would ban all accounts linked to the country's military as well as ads from military-controlled companies — a reflection of international outrage over the takeover. On Thursday, tensions escalated on the streets between anti-coup protesters and supporters of the military. Photos and videos posted on social media showed groups attacking people in downtown Yangon as police stood by without intervening. The number of injured people and their condition was not immediately clear.

Facebook bans all Myanmar military-linked accounts, ads

Yangon: Social media giant Facebook announced on Thursday it was banning all accounts linked to Myanmar's military as well as ads from military-controlled companies in the wake of the army's seizure of power on February 1.



It said in a statement that it was treating the post-coup situation in Myanmar as an "emergency," explaining that the ban was precipitated by events since the coup, including "deadly violence."

Facebook already has banned several military-linked accounts since the coup, including army-controlled Myawaddy TV and state television broadcaster MRTV. The bans are also being applied on Instagram, which is owned by Facebook. Facebook and other social media platforms came under enormous criticism in 2017 when right groups said they failed to act enough to stop hate speech against Myanmar's Muslim Rohingya minority.

Xi claims complete victory in eradicating poverty in China

Beijing: President Xi Jinping on Thursday declared that China has scored a "complete victory" in its fight against poverty by lifting over 770 million people out of it in the last four decades, calling it another "miracle" created by the country that will go down in history.

Xi said that all poor people in rural areas have been lifted out of poverty. With this, China has achieved the UN goal of poverty eradication 10 years ahead of the 2030 deadline, he said.

Over the past eight years, the final 98.99 million impoverished rural residents living under the current poverty line have all been lifted out of poverty. All the 832 impoverished counties and 1,28,000 impoverished villages have been removed from the poverty list, he said.

Since the launch of the reform and opening up in the late 1970s, 770 million impoverished rural residents have shaken off poverty when calculated according to China's current poverty line, he said. China has contributed to more than 70 per cent of global poverty reduction over the same period, Xi, also General Secretary of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC), said.

GOP rallies solidly against Dems' virus relief package

Washington: Republicans rallied solidly against Democrats' proposed \$1.9 trillion Covid-19 relief bill as lawmakers awaited a decision by the Senate's parliamentarian that could bolster or potentially kill a pivotal provision hiking the federal minimum wage.

Despite their paper-thin congressional majorities, Democratic leaders were poised to push the sweeping package through the House on Friday. They were hoping the Senate, where changes seem likely, would follow quickly enough to have legislation on President Joe Biden's desk by mid-March.

By late Wednesday, not one Republican in either chamber had publicly said he or she would back the legislation. GOP leaders were honing attacks on the package as a job killer that does too little to reopen schools or businesses shuttered for the coronavirus pandemic and that was not only wasteful but also even unscrupulous.

The relief bill includes a provision that over five years would hike the federal minimum wage to \$15 an hour. The parliamentarian is involved because Democrats are pushing the overall \$1.9 trillion measure through Congress under special rules that will let them avoid a Senate filibuster by Republicans. Those same rules prohibit provisions with only an "incidental" impact on the federal budget because they are chiefly driven by other policy purposes. The parliamentarian decides if a provision passes that test.

Republicans push back on Pelosi proposal for riot commission

Washington: Republican leaders in the House and Senate say a proposed plan for an independent commission to study the Capitol insurrection is overly tilted toward Democrats, arguing that the panel should have an even party split like the one formed to study the September 11 terrorist attacks.

House Republican leader Kevin McCarthy and Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell said Wednesday that a legitimate commission would be comprised of an equal number of Republicans and Democrats. A draft proposed by House Speaker Nancy Pelosi would create an 11-member commission with four Republicans and seven Democrats, three of whom would be chosen by President Joe Biden, according to one of multiple aides who spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss the details under negotiation.

China denies subjecting US diplomats to coronavirus anal tests

AP ■ BEIJING China on Thursday denied subjecting US diplomats to COVID-19 anal tests following reports from Washington that some of its personnel were being made to undergo the procedure.

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Zhao Lijian told reporters at a daily briefing that "China has never asked US diplomats in China to go through anal swab tests." A US State Department spokesperson said Washington was "committed to guaranteeing the safety and security of American diplomats and their families while preserving their dignity, consistent with the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations as well as other relevant diplomatic law provisions."

Countering Chinese Propaganda Act introduced in US Congress

Washington: A legislation has been introduced in the US Congress for countering the Chinese propaganda by creating a new sanctions authority against state-backed disinformation networks.

Republican Study Committee Chairman Congressman Jim Banks and Senator Tom Cotton on Wednesday introduced the Countering Chinese Propaganda Act. The bill requires the Secretary of State to examine whether or not the United Front Work Department meets the criteria to be sanctioned under this new authority.

Medical oxygen scarce in Africa

AP ■ DAKAR A crisis over the supply of medical oxygen for coronavirus patients has struck nations in Africa and Latin America, where warnings went unheeded at the start of the pandemic and doctors say the shortage has led to unnecessary deaths.

It takes about 12 weeks to install a hospital oxygen plant and even less time to convert industrial oxygen manufacturing systems into a medical-grade network. But in Brazil and Nigeria, as well as in less-populous nations, decisions to fully address inadequate supplies only started being made last month, after hospitals were overwhelmed and patients started to die.

Armenian PM faces military's demand to resign, talks of coup

Yerevan: Armenia's prime minister accused top military officers on Thursday of attempting a coup after they demanded he step down, adding fuel to months long protests calling for his resignation following the nation's defeat in a conflict with Azerbaijan over the Nagorno-Karabakh region.

The demonstrations began immediately after Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan signed a November 10 peace deal that saw Azerbaijan reclaim control over large parts of Nagorno-Karabakh and surrounding areas that had been held by Armenian forces for more than a quarter-century. Those protests have gathered pace this week, and the feud with his top military commanders has weakened Pashinyan's position. The immediate trigger for the standoff was Pashinyan's decision to oust the first deputy chief of the military's General Staff, a group of the armed forces' top commanders.

German police raid suspected Islamic extremists in Berlin

Hundreds of German police officers conducted coordinated raids early on Thursday in Berlin and the surrounding state of Brandenburg in the investigation of an organisation banned over allegations of Islamic extremism.
Some 850 police, including SWAT teams, were involved in the raids of apartments linked to members of the organisation known as Jama'atu Berlin, the state Interior Ministry said.
The organisation, whose name translates literally as the "Berlin Group", was banned by Berlin's state Interior Minister Andreas Geisel ahead of the raids on the grounds it was a "very radical" group that followed the Islamic State group's ideology.
"The ban is another clear signal to all religious extremists," Geisel said. "We will tolerate no place where terror is preached and the so-called Islamic State is glorified."

Budget tilted towards supporting growth: Moody's

FY22 FISCAL DEFICIT TARGET OF 6.8 PC REALISTIC

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

India's Budget is tilted towards supporting growth and the fiscal deficit target of 6.8 per cent for 2021-22 is realistic, Moody's Investors Service said on Thursday.

With regard to India's finances, Moody's said weak fiscal position will remain a key credit challenge in 2021.

It said the government's fiscal deficit for 2020-21 and 2021-22 should be lower than projected, supported by stronger revenue generation in ongoing March quarter and higher nominal GDP growth in the next fiscal year.

"India Budget tends to tilt a little bit in favour of support for growth. The deficit in Budget for FY'22 was above what we expected, but nevertheless we think that the deficit

target is a realistic one. "The government has incorporated a conservative assumption of nominal GDP growth and we think most revenue assumptions conservative, with the possible exception of monetisation expectations pegged in Budget," Moody's Associate Managing Director (Sovereign Risk) Gene Fang said.

Wide fiscal deficits combined with lower real and nominal

GDP growth over the medium term will constrain the government's ability to reduce its debt burden, Fang said in an online conference organised by Moody's and its affiliate ICRA on 'India Credit Outlook 2021'.

Moody's said the prospects for fiscal consolidation remain weak particularly given the government's mixed track record of implementing revenue-raising measures.

Retail loans to remain most affected due to pandemic: Moody's

New Delhi: Moody's Investors Service on Thursday said loans to retail customers, especially those to low-income borrowers, will remain most affected due to the shock caused by the coronavirus pandemic.

Despite the pandemic challenges, asset quality at Indian banks has performed better than expected at the start of the outbreak, Moody's said. "Corporate loans, in particular, have performed well because banks prior to the pandemic had largely provisioned for legacy problem loans and tightened underwriting standards," Moody's Vice President and Senior Credit Officer Srikanth Vadlamani said.

Govt accords top priority to startups, wants to create congenial atmosphere for growth: Minister

The Government accords top priority to startups and wants to create a congenial atmosphere for them to grow through various incentives and schemes, Union Minister Som Parkash said on Thursday.

Addressing the 'Assocam Startup Finale' event virtually, the Minister of State for Commerce and Industry highlighted that a number of incentives are being provided by the government for startups, ranging from how to form a busi-

ness to income-tax exemption and relaxation in labour laws.

He also observed that the credit guarantee scheme and a Fund of Funds with SIDBI have also been initiated.

"So, the government is giving top priority to these schemes. I assure from the government side whatever help is required, we all should work together to make India strong, to make India Aatmanirbhar," Parkash said, adding that he sees the future of India in these startups.

Subsidised, non-subsidised LPG price hiked by ₹25 per cylinder

Cooking gas LPG price on Thursday was hiked by ₹25 per cylinder across all categories, including subsidised fuel and those availed by Ujjwala scheme beneficiaries.

This is the third increase in rates this month on the back of spiralling international rates as demand recovered.

A 14.2-kg cylinder in Delhi now costs ₹794 as against ₹769 at which they were supplied on Wednesday, according to a price notification from state-owned fuel retailers. The increase is applicable across all categories including subsidised and non-subsidised users. LPG is available only at one rate, market price, across the country. The government, however, gives a small subsidy to select customers. However, this subsidy has been eliminated in metros and major cities through successive price increases over the past couple of years.

In the wake of the pandemic, the RBI undertook several conventional and unconventional measures.

"Unlike many central banks, the RBI's asset purchases did not dilute its balance sheet and hence, did not compromise on core principles of central banking," Das said while addressing an event organised by the Bombay Chamber of Commerce.

These purchases were confined to risk-free sovereign (government) bonds including state government securities only, he said. Other than conventional measures, RBI introduced long term repo operations (LTROs) and targeted long term repo operations (TLTROs) to augment the system as well as sector-specific liquidity to meet structural credit needs and alleviate stress, he said.

Special refinance facilities were provided to select All India Financial Institutions (AIFIs), while a special liquidity facility for mutual funds (SLF-MF) was introduced to ease redemption pressures, he added.

Cheque bounce cases: SC asks Centre if it can set up additional courts

In order to reduce pendency of cheque bounce cases which have reached 35 lakh across courts, the Supreme Court on Thursday asked the Centre whether it can create additional courts for expeditious disposal of such matters.

A bench of Chief Justice S A Bobde and Justices L Nageswara Rao and S Ravindra Bhat asked Additional Solicitor General Vikramjit Banerjee to inform it by next week whether the central government was willing to create additional courts under Article 247 for speedy disposal of cases under

ACT). Banerjee said he would seek instruction and inform the court by next date of hearing.

Article 247 of the Constitution gives power to Parliament to establish certain additional courts for the better administration of laws made by it or of any existing laws with respect to a matter enumerated in the Union List.

The top court was hearing a suo motu case to work out a mechanism for expeditious and just adjudication of cases relating to dishonour of cheques, fulfilling the mandate of law and reduce high pendency.

The bench told Banerjee

and senior advocate Siddharth Luthra, appointed as amicus curiae in the matter, that there are certain judgements which say the legislature is duty bound to conduct an impact assessment before creating of a new offence under the law.

It sought to know whether the government was under obligation for establishing additional courts to deal with cases under the NI Act, which is a central law.

Luthra gave certain suggestions to the court for evolving a mechanism for speedy disposal of such cases including sending of summons electronically through e-mail or social media.

Benchmarks build on gains amid F&O expiry

The Sensex surged past 51,000 points while the Nifty reclaimed the 15,000-mark on Thursday as indices darted up for the third straight session amid expiry of monthly derivative contracts and bullish global equities. A whopping increase in FPI inflows also boosted risk appetite, traders said. Foreign institutional investors purchased shares worth a net ₹28,739.17 crore on Wednesday, according to exchange data. Global markets followed Wall Street higher after US Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell said policy rates could remain low for years, calming inflation concerns.

Petro products in India getting costlier as crude-producing nations hiking prices: Pradhan

Union Petroleum Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on Thursday said petroleum products in the country are getting costlier due to rising prices of crude by oil-producing nations.

"In order to earn more profit in the interest of their countries, crude-supplying countries are increasing the prices of crude," said Pradhan while speaking to reporters here on the rise in the prices of petroleum products like petrol and diesel in India.

He said crude-supplying countries have been requested to desist from the hike in crude prices as it directly affects consumers.

They have created an artificial increase in the interest of their own country, he added. "Arbitrarily, you cannot hike the prices as it affects consuming countries," Pradhan said in reference to oil-producing countries. Owing to bad weather, the

production in the US has slowed in the past two-three weeks, Pradhan said.

The minister said he expects an improvement in the situation in some time. Now, the basic problem before the government is to provide relief, employment, save the jobs of the employed, make efforts so that people get money as well as improve health services, the minister said.

He added that the government has planned to provide free vaccine to poor senior citizens by investing ₹35,000 crore.

Pradhan said finances are required to develop rail, roads and ports, among others.

A JAB OF EXCITEMENT

Sacre bleu, the Kiger is actually good



Later today, the Indian Car of The Year (ICOTY) jury will announce the ICOTY for 2021. There are some very strong contenders this year and with the diverse jury, of which I am a member, will take a measured decision about which car will win. It will be a close contest I am sure. But I recently drove a car which is already a strong contender for next year's award, the Renault Kiger.

Despite recent events in Japan, the arrest and subsequent escape of Carlos Ghosn — which have shaken the Renault-Nissan alliance to its core, the two companies continue to work together in India. They share a large manufacturing facility South of Chennai and also share several vehicle platforms. The latest shared platform is the CMF-A modular platform, that allow for vehicles of different purposes to be built sharing common mechanicals. The first car from this was 2019's Renault Tribler, which was quite a good car. Now the Nissan Magnite and the Renault Kiger go head-to-head in the rather unique to India, 'subcompact' Sports Utility Vehicle (SUV) or what some describe as the 'beefed up' hatchback segment.

I'll get to the battle between the Magnite and the Kiger soon, but first a bit about Renault. The French carmaker has been moderately successful in India. They came into the market with

their eyes open, realised that India was a price-sensitive market and entered with the Duster, a built-to-a-price vehicle from Renault's Dacia stable in Romania. As we all know, the Duster was a hit. Yes, Renault's alliance with Mahindra was an ill-fated one which likely hit the success of the Logan sedan, but so did India's bizarre four-metre rule for cars. The Fluence and the Kaptur were commercial failures, possibly because Renault India did not have the pricing power that management thought they did, but conversely that is why the Kwid was a hit. Renault is clearly viewed as a value-for-money carmaker that doesn't make bad cars. Honestly, the Kiger is a good car for the money that you are paying for it. Prices

start at ₹5.45 lakh for the base model with the 72PS naturally-aspirated engine. The RXZ variant powered by the 100PS turbocharged engine that I was driving had an ex-showroom price of ₹8.55 lakh and had been specified with features like a wireless charger and a two-tone colour scheme which would have brought up the price a bit, but even at eight and a half lakh, you are flabbergasted at just how good the value on the car is. Let me get one thing straight up front, is this the best car in its class? No, it is not as nice inside and to drive as the Korean twins, the Sonet and Venue. The handling is not as sharp and while this turbo-engine responds faster and sounds smoother than what you experience on its rivals, the

overall ride comfort, handling and interiors, particularly the quality of the seats and plastics are better on the Korean cars. That said, you will be paying almost two lakh more for a properly specified variant compared to this manual turbo Kiger. And it isn't as if you don't get some nice features, you can specify wireless charging as an accessory which allows for wireless smartphone integration. The Renault infotainment operating system feels simpler than those on its rivals, but its simplicity means it is easier to navigate. The seven-inch digital display for the instrument cluster is well laid out and can be changed depending on which of the three drive modes (Eco, Urban or Sport) you select. Sport mode does

really does sharpen the engine and on the narrow winding roads of Goa's interiors, if you are willing to deal with some slight floatiness when you corner hand. My biggest gripe about the Kiger was actually the stitching on the steering wheel that isn't flush and when your hands need to move about a bit can be irritating. Between the Magnite and the Kiger then, which one should you choose? Keep in mind that these two cars have far more in common than the Sonet and Venue, not least because unlike Kia and Hyundai they have their own separate factories. While the Sonet and Venue as well as the Creta and Seltos are built on the same platform, the vehicles don't only look very dif-

ferent, they have noticeable differences in the way that they drive and handle. The Kiger and Magnite are built on the same production line by the same assembly workers and honestly, I would probably be nitpicking if I really wanted to find ride and handling differences.

The main differences are in the looks and interiors. Now, I heard a comment that called the Kiger 'a Kwid on steroids' but, that said, I actually like the Kwid's looks particularly after the refresh. Personally, I think the Renault looks smarter because while the Magnite is not bad-looking, I really do not like the grille. But aesthetics are a personal choice. But, I do prefer the interiors of the Kiger, things feel a bit better laid out, and while the interiors are similar to the Tribler, the Tribler does have a nice passenger cabin. So, for me, it would be the Kiger, but things are marginal here as well, you are more than welcome to disagree with me on this.

But the biggest difference is between the two brands, as I wrote earlier, Renault is well-established. The Duster, Kwid and Tribler have all done relatively well in the Indian market, there is a trust about the brand, you know that the product will be good and sales and service should not be worries. Nissan has not had that success over the years, and while the new management of the company is trying to make a difference, in the short run, I'm pretty sure the Kiger will outsell the Magnite even though both cars pretty much cost the same.

How would you define good times? Rather, how would you describe that I am really "into" the food? For me, it's when a dish lands at my table and 'just one bite' turns into five... The next thing I know is I am overeating just to hit that single moment of satisfaction over and over again. Doesn't it happen with you too? Well, tucked away in Gurugram's upmarket 32nd Milestone, THC — The House of Celeste is an Indian restaurant that triggered this feeling of contentment.

You know what they say, "The best chefs don't merely prepare food, but they serve memories." And it makes so much sense because once your belly is full, your sense of taste has been stimulated and your craving mitigated, what lives on are the memories. You may not remember all that you ate for a particular dinner but you will consistently recall the fulfillment you felt toward its end, perhaps, because of the freshness of the ingredients or the aroma of a specific dish. And that's why I think my visit to The House of Celeste was worth it!

Walking past the exteriors, through a hallway, I made my way into the cafe, which was segregated into different parts. The interiors were done up with round mirrors. The ambience — replete with solid colours, peppered with floral upholstery — seemed to be tailor-made for experimentation. As I ran my eyes over the menu, I realised that the cafe's USP was to offer a sense of familiarity and nostalgia. For instance, the very first dish corporate chef Valice Francis brought to the table was *Puchka Pebbles*. He asked me to have it in one go, which I did, and later to my surprise, I found out that they were a modern take on *pani puris* aka *gol gappas*. The 'pebbles' were made of white chocolate and had a chilly shell with a filling of tamarind chutney, mint and coriander water, and saffron tart. This sweet-salty, not so spicy treat was a great way



to start the meal. "This idea actually came from a molten choco lava cake," chef Francis shared. The cafe presents 'borderless cuisine with Indian elements'. The main endeavour was to provide rich and flavourful food made with local ingredients and vegetables, which have been sourced with highest safety standards in mind. It presented an innovative and contemporary menu offering small plates, large plates, sides and desserts with the season's finest ingredients. Each dish was centered around one core ingredient and was created to perfection with contrasting textures, colours and flavours.

Next in line was the *THC Papadi Chaat*. It was prepared using crisp fried dough wafers known as *papadi*, along with the boiled chickpeas, boiled potatoes, *dahi* (yogurt), tamarind chutney, and topped with *chat masala* and *sev*. The dish had sweet, sour, tangy and spicy flavours blended in one. I can still feel its creamy and crunchy texture in my mouth.

The next dish that caught my fancy was *Calcutta Beat*

Balls. Yes, it very much resembles the non-vegetarian meat balls. It was an unique entirely vegetarian creation that imitates non-vegetarian flavours. The tiny red balls were made of beetroot with a filling of smoked goat cheese cream to give an illusion of the meat balls — both visually and in taste. The flavours were impeccable, but the way it was presented was what stole the show. The chef rightly said as he chuckled, "It's an ideal option for a vegetarian who wishes to know what meat tastes like."

Typically, people, especially the more gastronomically experienced ones, concur that being a vegetarian is "out of place" with being a foodie. However, I can proudly say that I am both — a vegetarian and a foodie. And the menu bore witness to it too as it had a delectable list of vegetarian dishes.

Just like the food, the specially-curated cocktails were nothing short of indulgent. The cocktail menu aimed to elevate pleasure to a celestial level, where the familiar takes on a new sparkle, where the comfort-

ing becomes playful, and where classics find a contemporary form. Mixologist Dhawan Singh Jeena shared that they had an absolute-zero-waste bar. "For instance, fruit peels, dry flowers, coffee powder, leftover mint stems, squeezed limes, orange shells or other freeze-dried items are usually used in syrups and concoctions," said he. He believes that small steps can result in big changes.

To accompany the delectable food, the mixologist made a few cocktails like *Coffee Colada*, *Bittle Blush*, *Celest Mule* and more. Mixologist Dhawan shared that they haven't finalised their cocktail menu yet as they are still testing and poking around in the bar to create something refreshing and new. They would continue to add drinks to the menu, which seemed like a bonus for me to return.

The cafe had an inviting, comforting and laidback atmosphere. As I was still sampling food, *Paneer Khurchan* made its way to my plate. Apparently, the idea of the dish was derived from

the Hindi word '*khurchana*' which means 'to scrape'. So it was basically scraped paneer in a semi-dry gravy with some *achar* cream in it. The filling was stuffed in a steamed bun, which looked similar to a mini *kulcha*. I can bet one could eat this not so spicy and creamy delicacy even on a full stomach.

As I neared a saturation, the main course was in line, which included *Paneer Pasanda*, *Soya Keema Chettinad*, *Dal Moradabadi* along with *Gobi-Matar Kulcha* and traditional *Jodhpuri Chur Chur Naan*. The sous chef Ishan Ahluwalia's approach towards *Paneer Pasanda* was a little European and hence, he engineered the dish in the form of Ravioli. The cherry on top was that the *paneer* was baked instead of fried. The chef explained, "The authentic one is usually shallow fried. The stuffing has a lot of variations, but people prefer adding *khoya* and chopped nuts to it." It was served with parmesan crisp as garnish. Its gravy was a modification of *Makhani* gravy with the addition of onion paste. Well, full marks to the presentation as well as for setting my tongue on fire.

I am sure you would agree that *Keema* recipes are a popular element among all the meat lovers. THC's *Soya Keema*, prepared in a very Chettinad way, is a bonus for vegetarians like me. It had South-inspired flavours. They garnished it with *Malgapudi*, a South Indian spice mix, traditionally served with *idlis*. When you have travelled approximately 45 kms on traffic-stuffed streets that too on a weeknight with very little expectations from the food, but are welcomed with something marvelous, it is bound to win hearts.

With all this and more, what made my visit to THC priceless was the care and attention that chef Francis, sous chef Ishan and mixologist Dhawan put into every element, from the flavours, texture, presentation to the smell and the taste.



You are what you eat

Ahead of Protein Day, nutrition expert

Dr JAGMEET MADAN shares that issues around this important nutrient need to be constantly discussed and propagated

While a number of socio-economic issues hound us today, our right to basic nutrition and health is one that should be demanded across the globe, especially in India. It is, therefore, not surprising that the second goal in the 17 Sustainable Development Goals is 'Zero Hunger', which aims to reduce malnutrition in India. It begins with pregnant women and lactating mothers. A woman's diet during and immediately after pregnancy is pivotal for both, mother, and child, with proteins playing a key role in overall health and the baby's development. Diversity of diet and adequate quantity and quality of protein through variety of sources like pulses, dals, millets, whole grain cereals, milk and milk products, variety of beans and nuts and oilseeds are pertinent to be included in daily diet. For babies, the immunoglobulin of the breast milk derived from the colostrums adds to the benefits accrued from exclusive breast feeding of a baby for a minimum of six months which needs to be emphasised to all lactating mothers. The good quality protein based weaning foods with plant protein diversity should be an integral part of an infant's weaning foods.

For growing children, the need for protein intake is even more augmented as it not only helps in muscle and bone growth but also adds significantly to strengthening their immunity. Be it the usual routine at school, extra-curricular activities and cognitive development, protein plays an important role. The variety can be obtained from pulses and legumes, nuts and oilseeds, millets, oats, soybeans, almond or soy milk and peanut butter.

It is, therefore, important — may critical — to tackle the pressing issue of malnutrition and protein deficiency in specific head-on by not only creating awareness of protein-rich food sources but also dispelling misconceptions around accessibility, affordability, cultural nuances, and inherent hyperlocal habits. And this Protein Day, celebrated on February 27, with its theme of *Powering With Plant Protein*, let's delve into everything protein.

WHY PLANT PROTEIN?

We are perhaps the country with the single largest vegetarian population in the world with also a sizable population of flexitarians i.e. those who prefer a vegetarian diet while still enjoying meat (animal protein) in moderation. One of the key myths affecting the protein deficiency debate in India is the perception that not only are protein-rich foods expensive but that there is limited variety for those who don't eat meat — over 76 per cent recently surveyed shared this sentiment. Moreover, when presented with a number of protein-rich sources, a large segment of Indian mothers could only identify three out of 11 protein-rich foods correctly; thereby eliminating several key protein-rich sources completely.

This lack of knowledge coupled with the misconceptions that plant-protein is nutritionally inferior is myth to dispel as we continue in our quest to educate Indians about the role of proteins, especially plant-based protein rich diets that will help bridge the protein based nutrition and affordability gap.

IS IT FOR EVERYONE?

The quantity, quality and timing of protein consumed throughout the day across one's life span together play a role

in determining the health benefits of dietary protein. While one needs different levels of protein across different phases of life, the underlying key fact remains — protein is a key micronutrient that is essential for one's growth and development throughout life.

For healthy adults, who go about their day-to-day life, it is much required to continue to build immunity, maintain a healthy gut and repair of muscle wear and tear. In fact, it is believed that we may begin to naturally lose as much as eight per cent of overall muscle mass every decade after we turn 40, making it more important than ever to consume more protein as we age. Be it increased amounts of nuts, seeds, tofu, soy chunks, plant-based milk, beans such as edamame, green vegetables, jackfruit and pulses and legumes, adequate protein consumption based on one's requirements and lifestyle is crucial.

And while one may believe that protein's role with age might diminish, it is quite the contrary: With reports suggesting that one in three adults over the age of 50 experiences advanced muscle and strength loss, and thus, adequate protein intake is recommended for aging adults to support muscle and strength requirements.

Even as we recognise and act this Protein Day, it is important to make note that this cannot be a one-time or one-day discourse. Protein-related issues are very much an ongoing concern that need constant discussion, dialogue and education to continue on India's journey in becoming a healthy nation with sustainable well-being at its core.

R E C I P E S

GULAB JAMUN CHEESECAKE

WHAT YOU NEED

- Plain digestive biscuits: 350 gm
- Ghee or unsalted butter: 120 gm
- Cream cheese: 600 gm
- Jaggery: 350 gm
- Gulab Jamun: 8
- Sour cream: 1 cup
- Thickened cream: 200 ml
- Eggs (lightly beaten): 4
- Cornflour: 1/3 cup
- Lemon juice: 2 tsp
- Blueberry compote: 50 gm

METHOD

● Preheat the oven to 180 C. Grease a round 20 cm springform cake pan and line the base. Side with baking paper.

● Place biscuits in a food processor and whiz to crumbs. Add ghee and whiz to combine. Press into the base of prepared pan and chill until needed.



● Place cream cheese and 250 gm jaggery in a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment and beat until smooth. Beat in sour cream. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in

cornflour and lemon juice. Cut the *gulab jamuns* into halves and place them on the biscuit base. Then pour the cream cheese mix over it. Wrap the outside of the pan in three layers of foil and place in a large roasting pan. Add enough boiling water to come halfway up the sides of the cake.

● Reduce oven to 150 C and bake cake for one hour 40 minutes or until just set with a gentle wobble in the centre.

● Turn off oven and cool for three hours approximately or until cold. Remove from pan and place on a serving plate.

● When ready to serve, melt remaining 100 gm jaggery in a small saucepan over medium heat with two tablespoons of water, stirring to dissolve the jaggery. Cool completely, then pour over the cake.

● Garnish with blueberry compote and fresh mint leaves.

YAM FISH CURRY IN GOA ORGANIC MASALA

WHAT YOU NEED

- Yam: 3 cup
- Red pepper
- Coconut milk: 5 cup
- Onion (medium): 1
- Salt to taste
- ORCO hand-ground organic fish masala
- Organic ginger powder
- Organic cinnamon powder: 1/4 tsp
- Garlic: 4
- Organic Kashmiri chilli powder: 3 tsp
- Organic paprika powder:
- Balsamic or apple cider vinegar: 1/4 cup

METHOD

● In a steamer or pressure cooker, cook the yam pieces for 10 to 15 minutes until tender. Pierce the yams with a fork on all sides to allow the organic



masala to be absorbed. Keep aside.

● While the yams are steaming, grind together all the organic masala ingredients into a fine paste.

● In a pan on medium flame, add one cup of water, the organic masala and the onion and stir. Cook until the water is almost gone and you are left with a thick paste.

● Add the cooked yam pieces, coconut milk and salt. Stir

thoroughly to mix and boil it.

● Once boiling, lower the heat, add the red pepper slices and turn off the heat.

● Serve hot with rice or millets.

Pitch was good, quality of batting wasn't: Kohli

India captain Virat Kohli on Thursday said poor batting and not the pitch was responsible for the day-night third Test against England winding up inside two days and described the performance of batsmen on both sides as "bizarre".

Kohli insisted there were no demons in the pitch, which has been called "not ideal" by several former players like Michael Vaughan and Harbhajan Singh. Kohli said the track was absolutely fine at least in the first innings and only the odd ball was turning in the game which India won by 10 wickets on Thursday.

"To be honest, I don't think the quality of batting was up to standards. We were 100 for 3 and bowled out for less than 150. It was just that the odd ball turning and it was a good wicket to bat in the first innings," the India skipper said in his defence of the pitch.

Kohli said batsmen of both the sides did not apply themselves enough. Only Rohit Sharma (66 and 25 not out) and from England Zak Crawley (53 in first innings) managed to bat with ease.

"It was bizarre that 21 of the 30 wickets fell to straight balls. Test cricket is about trusting your defence. Lack of application ensured it was a quick finish," Kohli said.

Left-arm spinner Axar Patel stole the limelight in only his second Test along side veteran Ravichandran Ashwin by returning with match figures of 11 for 70 to earn the player-of-the-match award as India decimated England by 10 wickets to take an unassailable 2-1 lead in the four-match series.

Off-spinner Ashwin (15-3-48-4) also became the fourth Indian bowler and second fastest in the world to complete a commendable milestone of 400 Test wickets on Thursday.

Kohli showered praise on his two spinners for their match-winning efforts.

"A bizarre game which got over in 2 days. A lot of people were relieved when Jaddu (Ravindra Jadeja) got injured. But then this guy (Axar) comes in. Bowls it quicker and from a bigger height as well. If the wick-



et has something in it, Axar is very lethal. "I think we need to stand up and take notice of what Ashwin has done. In Tests, he is a modern day legend. As a captain, I am so pleased he is in my team," he said.

England skipper Joe Root was in no mood to give excuses for the heavy defeat, saying the tourists failed to capitalise on a decent start in the first innings after opting to bat.

"We were 70 for 2. But we didn't really capitalise on it. 250 on that wicket would have made it different. We will come back using this hurt and come back as a better team," he said.

Instead of blaming the pitch, Root said it was India's "high quality bowling" that made the difference.

"The plastic coating on the ball gathered

pace of the wicket. It was high quality bowling as well. Both sides struggled on that wicket. We don't define ourselves on a performance like this," he said.

"We shouldn't have any baggage from the previous games going into the last game. We have seen with the ball in hand, we can pick up wickets. I think it sums up the wicket, if I am getting a flier."

He also congratulated Ishant Sharma for playing his landmark 100 Tests and Ashwin for his 400 Test wickets.

Man-of-the-match Axar said his focus would remain on bowling wicket-to-wicket, a plan which has reaped him rich dividends so far in his nascent Test career.

"When it happens, it feels so easy, not so much when it doesn't," he joked. "I am not thinking much. I want to con-

It's for ICC to decide whether Motera pitch is fit for purpose: Root

England skipper Joe Root on Thursday said it is up to the ICC, and not the players, to decide whether the "difficult" Motera pitch is suitable for Test cricket after his side was crushed inside two days by India in a low-scoring day-nighter here.

Root refused to blame the surface for England's batting woes after the team folded for 112 and 81 in its two innings. But he said it is the ICC that should consider the suitability of the pitch for Test cricket.

"I think that this surface, it's a very challenging one, is a very difficult one to play on. It is not for players to decide whether it is fit for purpose or not and that is upto the ICC," said Root, who took a career-best five-wicket haul during India's first innings.

"As players we are going to try and counter what is in front of us as best as we can," he added.

Root said his team missed the opportunity to get a big first innings total, which seemed possible when it was 70 odd for just two wickets.

"We are disappointed, I feel we have missed an opportunity, more so in the first innings than anything. The position we found ourselves in at 71/2, we had a real chance to (score big).

"In hindsight, if we would have got 200, that would have been a very good score on that wicket and the game would have looked completely different," Root said at the virtual post-match press conference.

Indian left-arm spinner Axar Patel (6/38 and 5/32) and Ravichandran Ashwin (3/26 and 4/48) wreaked havoc on the surface. "We have got to get better and we are going to keep looking to find a way to scoring runs on surfaces like this," Root said.

England out of WTC final race

Ahmedabad: India knocked England out of contention from the ICC World Test Championship (WTC) final in June with their 10-wicket triumph which propelled the hosts to the top of the standings.

India now have to either win or draw the final game here starting March 4 to claim the right to take on New Zealand at the Lord's. The Black Caps have already qualified and are placed second in the latest list.

"England have dropped to 64.1 percentage points on the points table, which is now led by India with 71 percentage

points," the ICC stated.

"England are out of the race for a place in the final of the ICC World Test Championship after losing the third Test against India in Ahmedabad," it added.

England, who are now 2-1 down in the four-match series, needed to win the four-match series 3-1 to play the June 18-22 final.

New Zealand are assured of a place in the final with 70 percentage points. If India lose the final Test then Australia, who are in third place with 69.2 percentage points, will sneak in to make the final. PTI

Guptill finds form in run fest

Veteran batsman Martin Guptill returned to form with a blistering 97 as New Zealand held on for a nail-biting win over Australia in the second T20I in Dunedin on Thursday.

Guptill's Black Caps set Australia a challenging target of 220 after losing the toss but were made to sweat as Australia came within four runs of victory.

Both sides took advantage of University Oval's short boundaries in a thrilling match that featured 30 sixes and 434 runs at an average of 10.9 an over.

Marcus Stoinis starred for the Australians with 78 from 37 balls but Guptill's 97 from 50 laid the foundation for New Zealand's win.

Black Caps spinner Mitchell Santner also shone amid the batting fireworks, taking four for 31, while Australian paceman Kane Richardson managed three for 43.

New Zealand allrounder Jimmy Neesham was another exceptional performer, taking two wickets in the final over when a rampant Australia needed 15 runs for victory. Neesham also scored an undefeated 45, including six sixes.

The result puts New Zealand 2-0 up in the five-match series, on the brink of a win over the world's second-ranked T20 team.

Guptill's innings gave him the record for the most sixes in T20 Internationals with 132, taking him past India's Rohit Sharma on 127.

The 34-year-old clubbed the ball over the boundary eight times, bludgeoning all comers in the Australian attack. He fell just short of his third Twenty20 century after being caught trying



to hit a Daniel Sams delivery out of the ground.

Guptill averaged only 17 in the recent series against the West Indies and Pakistan, then managed just 11.5 in the domestic competition before picking up a hamstring injury.

Pressure on the opener intensified when he made a duck in the first match against Australia on Monday, with calls for uncapped Finn Allen to join the squad. But he answered his critics with a return to his big-hitting best, bringing up 50 off 27 balls, with eight boundaries, including four sixes. Guptill insisted he had not changed his approach during the game-turning innings.

Messi's brace helps Barca close gap on top

Barcelona: Lionel Messi soared past Luis Suarez to become La Liga's top scorer on Wednesday by adding his 17th and 18th goals of the season in a much-needed 3-0 victory for Barcelona over Elche.



Barca had followed up last week's crushing Champions League loss to PSG by drawing at home to Cadiz on Sunday but eased the strain with a comfortable win at the Camp Nou.

Messi's double owed much to a pair of superb assists, with a supreme dribble by Frenkie de Jong coming after a sublime flick from Martin Braithwaite, who also set up Jordi Alba to score a third.

After failing to take full advantage of league leaders Atletico Madrid's defeat by Levante on Saturday, this victory puts Barcelona back in third, five points off the top, having played a game more than Atletico.

Just as importantly, it puts Ronald Koeman's side back on track after two disappointing results threatened to extinguish momentum gained in recent weeks.

Even if Atletico prove too far ahead to catch, a positive performance was important, especially with a semi-final second leg to come next week against Sevilla in the Copa del Rey, which may be their only chance of winning a trophy this term.

Messi's return to top form comes as a huge boost too. This was his fifth and sixth goal in his last four games while no player from the top five European leagues has scored more than his 13 this year in all competitions. Bayern Munich's Robert Lewandowski is closest on 12. AFP
