UK PM orders stay-at-home lockdown to combat new corona variant PNS NEW DELHI

Given the current alarming Situation in the United Kingdom after the new strain of coronavirus, UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson has cancelled his visit to India later this month. He was named as the chief guest at the Republic Day parade.

Johnson had accepted the invitation last month and it was to be his first bilateral visit after the UK parted ways with the European Union in December. Incidentally, his scheduled visit to New Delhi would have been the first such event involving a world leader since the pandemic broke out.

The UK PM announced

the decision to cancel his visit hours after his Government ordered a fresh lockdown in England following the new strain of coronavirus affecting a large number of people there.
Johnson called off the visit

after speaking to Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "The



Prime Minister spoke to Prime Minister (Narendra) Modi this morning, to express his regret that he will be unable to visit India later this month as planned," read a statement from his Downing Street office.
"In light of the national

lockdown announced last night, and the speed at which the new coronavirus variant is spreading, the Prime Minister said it was important for him to remain in the UK so he can focus on the domestic response to the virus," it read.

"The leaders underlined their shared commitment to the bilateral relationship, and to continuing to build on the close collaboration between our countries, including in response to the pandemic," it added.

Johnson would have

become the second British

Prime Minister to attend the Republic Day parade as the Chief Guest after his predecessor John Major in 1993. "The Prime Minister said he hopes to be able to visit India in the first half of 2021, and ahead of the UK's G7 Summit that Prime Minister Modi is due to attend as a guest," his office said.

While accepting Modi's invitation, Johnson had extended an invite to the Indian Prime Minister to attend the UK's G7 Summit as one of three guest nations alongside South Korea and Australia — with a focus on his declared ambition to work with a group of "like-minded democracies" to advance shared interests and tackle common challenges.

Based on dry-run feedback, Ministry ready to introduce it within 10 days from date of emergency use approval

he Covid-19 vaccines The Covid-19 vaccines cleared by the top drug controller (DCGI) on January 3 is likely to be rolled out with in 10 days from the date of emergency use authorisation, the Union Health Ministry said on Monday even as it added that the final decision lies with the Government.

"Based on the feedback of

dry-run, the Ministry is ready to introduce Covid-19 vaccine within 10 days from date of emergency use authorisation," Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan said at a Press conference here.

The country's drugs regulator on January 3 granted restricted emergency use approval to Oxford-AstraZeneca's Covishield and also to indigenously developed Covaxin of Bharat Biotech. Prior to it, the Government had successfully held dry-run pan India with an aim to test the laid-out mechanism for the mega vaccination anism for the mega vaccination drive and to assess operational feasibility of using Co-WIN application in field environ-ment for planning, imple-mentation and reporting at the block, district and State

delivery management system in a bulk manner. The Ministry also put forward the CoWIN Delivery Management plan.

"There are 4 primary vaccine stores called GMSD located in Karnal, Mumbai, Chennai and Kolkata, and there are 37 vaccine stores in the country. They store vaccines in bulk and distributes further," Bhushan said, adding that the vaccine will further be taken from these stores and taken to subcentres "via passive equipment

like rice boxes."

Bhushan said the Co-WIN app can be used by any country who wants to do so, as the system is made for India and

the world.

While healthcare and

frontline workers will not be required to register themselves, Bhushan said when they would come to the population prior ity group, the need for registration would come.

BJP heaves sigh of relief in Chandigarh, nomination of rebel rejected

day after facing major Aembarrassment, the ruling BJP on Tuesday heaved a sigh of relief following the rejection of nomination papers of rebel councillors Chandrawati Shukla for mayor post. The BJP had a day before saw rebellion in the party after the announcement of the candidates for mayoral polls, scheduled to be

held on January 8.

Few minutes after the announcement of party candidates by BJP for polls, a revolt had erupted in the party with rouncillor Chanderwati Shukla filing nomination indepen-dently for mayor post while another party councillor Bharat Kumar had announced to resign from the saffron party.
With majority in the

Municipal Corporation house and rejection of nomination of Chandrawati Shukla on technical grounds, the BJP is now set to emerge victorious in mayoral polls. Senior deputy mayor and councillor Ravi Kant Sharma was declared the BJP candidate for the post of mayor and coun-

Sidhu and Farmila as the candidates for the posts of senior deputy mayor and deputy

mayor, respectively.
This year, the mayor post is open for candidates from the general category, unlike last time when it was reserved for female candidates. The new mayor will replace incumbent Raj Bala Malik. The Chandigarh mayor holds a one-year term and is chosen every year from among the elected representa-tives of the General House. A candidate needs at least 14 votes to become a mayor since the current House has a strength

of 26 members.
Of these, the BJP has a majority with 20 councillors. The Congress has five councillors and the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) has one councillor.

Besides, one vote is that of the Member of Parliament, the ex-officio member of the House. MP Kirron Kher is unwell and is unlikely to vote. On the other hand, SAD has announced to boycott the election. Apart from mayor, senior deputy mayor and deputy mayor will also be elected on the same day.

Congress

Saffron party set to win mayoral polls Devinder Singh Babla has filed

his nomination for the post of Mayor while the party councillors Ravinder Kaur Gujral and Satish Kainth have filed papers for the posts of senior deputy mayor and deputy mayor, respectively. The Congress had win the elections earlier announced to support Chandrawati Shukla in the polls.

Gopal Shukla, who is also a BJP leader while talking to The Pioneer claimed that he has the support of eight BJP councillors and will take a final decision on who to support after holding a discussion with them.

As the nomination of my wife is rejected, we will now decide who to support in the polls, he added.

Chandrawati's husband

Arun Sood, BJP chief Chandigarh however claimed that the party has reached out to Chandrawati and her hus-band and also Bharat Kumar. BJP will win with a huge majority and all 20 councillors will vote for the party candidates, he said. I have met Bharat Kumar and he has not tendered his resignation. I have also met Gopal Shukla and all party leaders are councillor united now, Sood said

The Congress, on the other hand, is pinning hopes on cross-voting by BJP rebels to

Chandigarh Congress chief Pradeep Chhabra said that the nomination of Chandrawati was rejected under a conspiracy hatched by BJP. The saffron party was set to lose in the polls and hence got her nomination rejected, he claimed.

Notably, it is not the first time when the BJP has faced rebellion in the mayoral polls. In the 2020 mayoral polls, when Raj Bala Malik was nominated, another councillor Heera Negi had criticised the

move openly.

In 2019 polls, all four Congress councilors had ended up supporting BJP rebel Satish Kainth, who had later joined the Congress before Lok Sabha elections. Councillor Satish Kainth had filed papers against the party's official choice, Rajesh Kalia, and gave him a tough fight, losing by just three votes. In 2018, the then outgo ing mayor Asha Jaswal rebelled against BJP candidate Davesh Moudgil, although she later withdrew her nomination

Farmers defer tractor march to Jan 7

Pollowing the bad weather in Delhi-NCR, the Sanyukt Kisan Morcha on Tuesday deferred their proposed tractor march by a day to January 7 to intensify their protest against the Centre's new farm laws.

Addressing a Press conference at Singhu Border, the epicentre of the protest, Sanyukt Kisan Morcha leaders said thousands of farmers will take out the tractor march from all protest sites to the Kundli-Manesar-Palwal (KMP) on January 7.
"The decision to defer the

march was taken over forecast of bad weather condition on Wednesday. The agitation against the three agriculture laws will be intensified in the coming days," said Yogendra Yadav, Swaraj Abhiyan leader. Talking about their other

China tried to change status quo in Ladakh: Def Ministry


India responded to in a firm and non-escalatory way, says report

As tension continues for the Aninth month at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) and several rounds of talks unable to break the logiam, the Defence Ministry has said China tried to forcefully and unilaterally change the status quo in Ladakh.

China also ramped up its troop strength in the border region on its side of the LAC leading to stand-off and tension all along the LAC, the Ministry said in its annual year-end

review released recently. Unilateral and provocative



change the status quo by force, in more than one area on the LAC, were responded to in a firm and non-escalatory way, ensuring the sanctity of our claims in Eastern Ladakh, the report said.

"The Indian Army has maintained all protocols and agreements between the two countries while the Chinese escalated the situation by utilisation of unorthodox weapons and amassing a large number

of troops," the report said.

The use of orthodox weapons was in obvious reference to the Chinese troops using clubs and nail-studded rods to attack the Indian soldiers in the Galwan valley on

June 15.

The bloody brawl left 20 Indians, including the commanding officer, dead. Scores of Chinese casualties were also

The Indian Army with assistance from IAF, mobilised troops, including accretionary forces, in a very short duration including heavy equipment like guns, tanks as also ammu-

nition, rations and clothing.
On August 28-29, the Indian troops in a precaution-ary step, pre-empted Chinese expansionist designs and occupied heights along the southern bank of Pangong Tso.

Haryana Govt gives relief to small traders

decided to provide one per cent (1%) exemption of Market Fee to them with turnover upto Rs 5 lakh per annum.An official spokesman on Tuesday said Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar has approved a proposal in this regard, adding that for this, necessary amendments would be made in Haryana Agricultural Produce Markets (General) Rules, 1962. He said would submit final annual return in the Market Committee on the closure of a financial year showing that his total annual turnover from sale purchase of agricultural produce in Haryana was less than Rs 5 lakh in the previous year, would be entitled to claim refund upto 1 per cent market fees on the said turnover if he has deposited any market fees in any market committee of the State on such sale purchase.

The spokesman said that the chief minister has also approved to amend Rule 17 of the Harvana the Haryana Agricultural Produce Markets (General) Rules, 1962 providing for the criteria for issue of category (iii) licence. According to the amendment, the requirement for getting this category (iii) license would be exceeding Rs 5 lakh and not exceeding Rs 12 lakh. With this, the small traders with annual turnover of less than Rs 5 lakh would not have to get the license required under section 10 and Rule-17.

Not only this, the local birds such as crows have also been found dead in the wetland area triggering concerns for the alarming situation in Kangra

The state Cabinet meeting held under Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur reviewed the situation arising due to the bird flu in the state.

The cabinet has directed the Department of Health and Department of Animal Husbandry to ensure adequate availability of medicines spe-cific to the H5N1 and PPE kits for staff. The cabinet has further directed strict enforcement of restrictions on movement imposed around Pong wet-land by the Deputy

Commissioner, Kangra.

A report from National
Institute of High Security
Animal Diseases in Bhopal, had a day before confirmed the presence of H5N1 avian influenza in the samples of five dead Bar- Headed Goose found at Pong Dam in Himachal's Kangra district.

Sources said that all the wetlands including Renuka wetland, which hosts migrato-ry birds every year, wildlife ry birds every year, wildlife sanctuaries and zoos in the state have been put on alert. Samples collected from migra-tory birds at Renuka Dam have also been sent for bird flu test-Samples from poultry farms have also been collected

for testing, said sources

The samples of blood, fae-cal or throat swab of the birds are collected for the disease investigation.

It is for the first time that bird flu has been reported at the Pong wetland which is known as migratory birds' paradise as it hosts more than one lakh winged guests during winter season.

Sources said that due to the bird flu, the annual avian census conducted at Pong Dam in January and February will be suspended this year. Given the current situation, the area is likely to remain under surveillance and carrying out sanitization exercise for about a month's time, sources said.

All kinds of human and livestock activities have already been banned in the one km area around the lake which is declared as alert zone (red zone) while the next nine km area has been declared a surveillance zone.

According to the census exercise conducted in January this year, as many as 1.15 lakh birds of 114 species were recorded at the Pong Dam

Lake.
"More than 2300 migratory birds have died till now. We have sounded an alert due to bird flu and all precautionary measures are being taken by the field staff at the Pong Dam," said Rahul Rohane, Deputy Conservator of Forests, Wildlife Division, Hamirpur while talking to The Pioneer.

He said that on an average, death of more than 200 migratory birds is being reported every day at the wetland. The Department is following the

guidelines for burning and burying the carcasses of migra-

Maximum fatalities have been seen among Bar-Headed Goose. Fatalities have also been reported in species namely Common Teal, Northern Shoveler, Common Pochard Tufted Duck, Black-headed Gull among others, he added

As a precautionary measure, sale of poultry products and fish have been banned in Fatehpur, Dehra, Jawali and Indora subdivisions of Kangra district till further orders.

The Pong Dam, also

known as Pong Reservoir, Pong Dam Lake and the Maharana Pratap Sagar is a well-known wildlife sanctuary and one of the international wetland sites declared in India by the Ramsar Convention. Every year, more than one lakh migratory birds of over 100 species from Siberia and Central Asia descend on Pong wetland for their winter sojourn.

Alongside the Covid-19 outbreak across the world last year, there have been bird flu outbreaks in several countries in Europe and East Asia. In India, the outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza has also affected states namely Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Kerala.

Notably, humans can get infected by H5N1 only upon close interaction with infected live or dead birds, or H5N1contaminated environments. If infected, humans tend to fall severely ill and also require hospitalisation. Oseltamivir, an antiviral medicine is used wide ly to prevent severity of the virus and death.

Amid bird flu scare, alert at Sultanpur, Bhindawas wetlands in Haryana

raking precautionary measures in view of the death of thousands of migratory birds in the Pong Dam of Himachal Pradesh due to bird flu, Haryana Department of Forests and Wildlife has sounded an alert in the wetlands of Sultanpur Lake and Bhindawas where thousands of migratory birds have arrived for their annual

Talking to 'The Pioneer' over the phone, Sultanpur National park (wildlife) Inspector Rajesh Chahal said that no casualty has been reported in this part of the region but the possibility of the disease reaching the wetlands cannot be ruled out. 'Nonetheless, teams of the Wildlife Department are keeping round-the-clock vigil at Sultanpur wetlands. In the recent census, around 20, 000 migratory birds had arrived at Sultanpur wetlands," he

Asked if it could pose a threat to other aquatic creatures that survive in waters, he

said:
"An alarming rise in deaths is concerning and requires a serious follow-up". Observing the current situathat a group of individuals

who provide extra information about the birds or aquatic species and habitat, and local riparian residents had been roped in to keep an eye on any abnormal behaviour of water fowls.
"The idea is to keep as

many eyes on suspicious activity as possible. They have been told to report back if fresh bird carcasses are found. Our teams have been keeping a watch 24x7 on a rotational basis," he said.

When contacted Haryana Chief Conservator of Forests (wildlife) ML Rajvanshi, said, "So far, we have not detected mortality among birds in Sultanpur and Bhindawas wet-lands. We are on the alert."

He said that an advisory has been issued that all zoos remain alert and vigilant for any symptoms among captive animals and incidence, if any,

in nearby areas.
Similarly, veterinarians have been engaged in preventive care of the birds.

After the highly infectious Asian avian influenza (H5N1) led to the death of about 2000 migratory birds in Pong Dam wetland in Kangra district of Himachal Pradesh besides 1 lakh poultry birds in Haryana's Barwala belt in Panchkula district suspected to be due to the virus, the wildlife officials have been put on high alert in the State.

He said, "Considering this grave situation, we have asked the officials to take all possible measures/precautions to prevent the trans-mission of disease in other animals, birds and human

beings.

The officials have been asked to create awareness that any sighting of a dead bird by volunteers, bird watchers and others should be reported to the nearest forest/animal husbandry office."

Directing the officials concerned to remain vigilant for birds, animals showing symptoms, another Wildlife official said that staff members have been asked to wear rubber gloves and protective clothing that can be disinfected or disposed of and protective eyewear or a face shield while handling ani-

They should wash hands with soap and water often and disinfect work surfaces and equipment between sites. Officials have been advised to not to eat, drink, or smoke

while handling animals.
"All the wildlife officials have been asked to create awareness about the spread, testing and prevention of swine flu and we have also asked them to ensure that there are enough medicines to treat any cases that are being reported," he added.

4L unusual deaths of poultry birds in Panchkula, samples collected and sent to RDDL, Jalandhar

Unusual death of four lakh Upoultry birds has occurred in the last ten days in 20 poultry farms with epi-centers near Garhi Kutaha and the other nearby village Jaloli in Barwala area in Panchkula district, an official of Haryana, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Department said on Tuesday, triggering alarm bells.

"There are a total of 77,87,450 birds in poultry farms in Panchkula district and the mortality of birds was 4,09,970. The samples were collected and sent to Regional Disease Diagnostic Laboratory (RDDL), Jalandhar from where the report is still awaited and cur-rently RDDL team has reached Barwala area for resampling of birds.

There are no confirmed reports of Avian Influenza as yet, he added. Among the suspected diseases can also be Ranikhet or Infectious laryngeo-trachitis.

Elaborating on it further he said that even though the mortality in poultry is higher as compared to previous months, the department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying has a standard advisory regarding the consumption of poultry in case of Avian influenza. As per the advisory, the poultry and poultry products can be cooked and consumed as usual with no fear of acquiring infection with the avian influenza virus.

Listing out the details of the advisory the spokesperson said that in areas free of the disease, poultry and poultry products can be cooked and consumed as usual (following good hygienic practices and proper cooking) with no fear of acquiring infection with the avian influenza virus. He stated that the avian influenza virus is sensitive to heat. Moreover, the normal temperatures used for cooking in India (70°C for all parts of the food) can kill the virus. Henceforth, before consuming poultry consumers should ensure that all parts of the poultry are fully cooked (no "pink" parts) and that eggs, too, are properly cooked (no "runny" yolks), he added.

On the things to take care of while food preparation the spokesperson said that during food preparation, raw poultry and poultry products should never be allowed to mix with items eaten raw. Moreover when handling raw poultry or raw poultry products, persons involved in food preparation should wash their hands thoroughly and clean and disinfect surfaces in contact with the poultry products. Soap and hot water are sufficient for this purpose, he added.

Punjab to conduct crash investigation of all major road accidents

bring down the fatalities To bring down the first land and in the state from 14 per day to at least the national average of seven, the Punjab Government has decided to conduct a Crash Investigation of all the major road accidents in the state.

The proposed investiga-tion would help in ascertaining the reasons for accidents which could have happened due to the engineering fault, lack of enforcement, vehicle fault, among others, so that remedial measures can be initiated.

Besides, the Government has also decided to conduct a third party audit of all vulnerable road stretches in the State by an independent agency.

The decisions were taken during the meeting of the Punjab State Road Safety Council (PSRSC), headed by the state Transport Minister Razia Sultana, to review the

action taken by the stakeholders on implementation of road safety laws in the State.

The Minister issued directions to the officials concerned $% \left\{ \left\{ \left\{ \left\{ \left\{ \left\{ \left\{ \left\{ \right\} \right\} \right\} \right\} \right\} \right\} \right\} \right\} \right\}$ to implement some major decisions, including purchase of reflectors to cover nearly 50,000 stray cattle and rectify all the black spots by March 31, 2021.

During the meeting, it was decided to expedite the purchase of equipment for road safety like speed guns, breath analyzers, besides filling up of vacant posts in lead agencies and implementation of directions issued by the Supreme Court Committee of Road Safety. The Minister advised all the agencies involved in the road safety to work in mission mode so that precious lives can be saved.

"As many as 502 road accidents with stray animals are reported in Puniab during the last three years (2015-2018) in which 370 people lost their lives, 157 seriously injured, and 59 got minor injuries," said an official spokesperson of the Department.

Spokesperson said that the problem becomes more serious due to foggy conditions during the months of December to February. "The meeting also decided that due to intense foggy conditions in the State, there is a need to put fluores-cent reflectors on stray cattle and for this purpose, the Council will incur the expenditure of nearly Rs 25 lakhs for the purchase of reflectors to cover nearly 50,000 stray cattle in the state," added the

Informing about black spots, the spokesperson said that an accident black spot is a road corridor of about 500-meter-long stretch on which either five road accidents involving fatalities and grievous injuries had been reported during the last three calendar years or 10 fatalities during the

Despite having a well-structured primary healthcare infrastructure and an impressive institutional delivery rate, at least half of the total infants ie one in two babies born in Tamil Nadu do not get the much-needed mother's milk within an hour of their birth, according to a report released here recently online.

"It is puzzling that in a State where 99 per cent of deliveries are institutional, both public and private, initiation of breastfeeding within an hour of birth is only at 54.7 per cent. There is other disturbing data, such as that 34 per cent of births are by cae-

sarean section.
"This is well above the WHO threshold of 15 per cent as well as the rate recorded in other states," said former Union Health Secretary Keshway Desiraju while commenting on the observation nade in report titled 'Spotlight on infant feeding in Tamil Nadu 2020 -tracking policies and programmes in support of women and children to adopt optimal feeding

2 years or beyond." The first ever report of assessment of policy and programmes in the State prepared by the Breastfeeding Promotion Network of India (BPNi) and its State Breastfeeding Trends Initiative (SBTi) team was released by J Radhakrishnan, Principal Secretary to the TN Government recently.



As per the report, TN scored 64 out of 100 in the first assessment of the 10 parameters of policy/programmes on breastfeeding and infant and young children feeding practices.

Tamil Nadu is not doing well particularly in breastfeeding, implementation of the Infant Milk Substitutes Feeding Bottles, and Infant Foods (Regulation of Production, Supply and Distribution) Act 1992, and Amendment Act 2003, and on Infant Feeding during disasters, said the report.

Dr Arun Gupta from BPNi pointed out that optimal feeding includes early breastfeeding within one hour of birth, exclusive exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months and continued breastfeeding for two years or and appropriate complementary feeding after six months

According to health experts, breastfeeding prevents diarrhoea, pneumonia in children and provides long-term benefits against non-communicable diseases It also reduces risk of breast and ovarian cancer in the mothers and protects them from diabetes.

SC spells out green conditions for Govt to refurbish Central Vista project

The Supreme Court on Tuesday asked the Centre to consider issuing directions to ensure adequate use of antismog guns and make setting up of smog towers a "mandatory requirement" during construction of development pro-jects involving Government buildings, townships or other major private projects.

The top court said this in its 2:1 majority verdict by which it paved way for the ambitious Central Vista Project, covering a three-km stretch from Rashtrapati Bhavan to India Gate in Lutyens" Delhi.

"We deem it fit to call upon the respondent MoHUA (Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs) to consider issuing appropriate general directions so smog guns during the con-struction of development projects and setting up smog towers is made a mandatory requirement, particularly involving government buildings, townships or other major private pro jects," said Justice A Khanwilkar, writing the 432page majority judgement for himself and Justice Dinesh Maheshwari.

NIA files supplementary chargesheet in Hizbul narcotic terror case

The National Investigation Agency on Tuesday filed a supplementary chargesheet in the Hizbul Mujahideen (HM) narco terror case before the NIA Special Court, Mohali, Punjab against alleged narcoterrorists Jaswant Singh of Gurdaspur and Gursant Singh of Tarn Taran, Puniab.

Both the accused persons were charged for criminal conspiracy, impersonation, using forged documents as genuine and destruction of evidence under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and relevant provisions of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act and Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act.

The accused persons were involved in collection, distribution and selling of heroin also in collection and channelization of proceeds generated for furthering the activities of the banned terror group Hizbul Mujahideen.

"Accused Gursant Singh vas one of the important members of the terrorist gang and as a close associate of prime accused Iqbal Singh alias Shera was responsible for safe movement of heroin and proceeds to

various places/unknown persons," the NIA said in a state

Investigation has also brought out that he has purchased many immovable properties and luxury cars to be used as hide outs and for transportation of drugs and proceeds, it said.

Earlier, a chargesheet was filed on October 20 last year against ten accused persons including arrested Hilal Ahmed Shergojri of Pulwama, Bikram Singh of Amritsar (arrested), Singh of Amritsar (arrested), Maninder Singh (arrested), Ranjit Singh (arrested), Gagandeep Singh (arrested), Iqbal Singh, all from Amritsar (absconding), Ranjit Singh (arrested) and Jaswant Singh (arrested), both from (arrested), both from Gurdaspur, Zafar Hussain Bhat of Anantnag, presently in Pakistan (absconding) and Pulwama (killed).

NIA files chargesheet against 30 accused

The Kochi unit of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Tuesday submitted the first part of the charge sheet in the gold smuggling scam that rocked the Kerala Government.

The chargesheet which runs into hundreds of pages lists 30 persons including Swapna Suresh, Sarith as accused. Sandeep Nair, who was arrested along woth Swapna and Sarith has turned approver in the sensational

The NIA was expected to file the chargesheet with the special court hearing the case within 180 days of the first arrest. Radhakrishna Pillai, the investigation officer, handed over the first part of the chargesheet before the dead-line. Though the contents in the chargesheet are yet to be released, sources in the NIA said that the accused had been slapped with section 16, 17 and 18 of the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act which would make it difficult for the accused

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday attached shares worth ₹452 crore of ILFS Tamil Nadu Power Company Limited (ITPCL) held by a Singapore-

based shell company.
"The ED has provisionally attached assets totaling to ₹452 crores belonging to AS Coal Pte Singapore, a Singapore-based shell company owned by a British National Jaimin Vyas under Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002 (PMLA) in a case relating to fraud," the agency said in a statement.

The attached assets are in

the form of 8.86 per cent shares of ITPCL presently worth around ₹452 crore, it said.
The ED had initiated inves-

tigation under PMLA on the asis of FIR registered by EOW, Delhi against IRL, ITNL (Group companies of IL&FS) its officials and others.

Investigation was also conducted by the Serious Fraud Investigation office (SFIO) and criminal complaint has been filed by SFIO against IL&FS Financial Services (IFIN) and its officials invoking sections of

Companies Act, 2013. "Investigation under PMLA revealed that there was a well planned conspiracy to defraud IL&FS and Indian Banks by Jaimin Vyas in connivance with officials of IL&FS and one

Chinese EPC Contractor namely SEPCO III. The company's right to select the EPC con-tractor was illegally delegated to Jaimin Vyas, violating the terms and conditions of Share

Purchase Agreement," it said. Jaimin Vyas thereafter nominated SEPCO as EPC contractor and got kick back in guise of fees for consultancy services. The same money was routed as equity investment in ITPCL. Subsequently, ITPCL paid SEPCO III the amount (paid earlier by SEPCO to Jaimin Vyas) by inflating the value of the contract and pay-ments were also made in the guise of early completion of the

project, the agency said.
Further, investigations also
revealed that Jaimin Vyas revealed in that jaimin vyas received illegal gratification from Noble Coal in lieu of awarding a coal supply contract (to ITPCL) at an inflated rate, it said.

Earlier, ED had attached movable and immovable properties of committee of directors of IFIN worth ₹126 crore, and movable and immovable properties of two defaulter loanees of IFIN namely SIVA Group and ABG Group worth ₹1,400 crores. Arun Kumar Saha, one of the former members of committee of directors of IFIN and Karunakaran Ramchand, former MD of ITNL were arrested and prosecution complaint has been filed under PMLA against the duo, it said.

CREMATORIUM ROOF COLLAPSE

Adityanath directs officials to invoke NSA against accused

Bains informed that the State Economic Offence Wing has registered a PE (preliminary enquiry) in the matter. He also sought two weeks' time to apprise the Election Commission (EC) of further action in the matter. Additional Chief Secretary (Home) Rajesh Kumar Rajora was also present at the meeting. In December, the EC had decided to call top officials of the Madhya Pradesh government to apprise it of its orders to lodge "criminal action" against the three IPS

officers and others.

Election Commission sources identified the three IPS officers as Sushovan Banerjee, Sanjay Mane, V Madhu Kumar and state police

The EC had said it was recommending action after it "deliberated" upon a report sent to it by the CBDT (Central Board of Direct Taxes) intimating it about the Income Tax Department's "search opera-tions in Madhya Pradesh and its findings of extensive use of unaccounted cash during the

2019 general elections".

The CBDT, on April 8 last year, had said in a statement that tax sleuths recovered Rs 14.6 crore "unaccounted" cash and seized diaries and computer files of suspect payments after the raids. It said the department detected a trail of Rs 20 crore suspect cash allegedly being moved to the "headquarter of a major political party in Delhi".

Govt to hold exam on 'gau vigyan' on Feb 25

The Government on Tuesday announced a national-level voluntary online exam on 'gau vigyan' (cow science) to be held on February 25, in a bid to generate interest among students and the general public about the indigenous cow and its

Announcing the first-ever exam of this kind, Rashtriya Kamdhenu Aayog (RKA) Chairman Vallabhbhai Kathiria said this exam will be held annually

Students of primary, secondary and college levels and general public can take part in the 'Kamdhenu Gau-Vigyan Prachar-Prasar Examination' without any fee.

"For raising mass aware-ness about the indigenous cows among young students and other citizens, the RKA decided to conduct a national exam on cow science," he told reporters.

The Aayog has prepared a study material on cow science.

The exam will infuse the curiosity into all Indians about cows and make them aware of the unexplored potential and business opportunities a cow can offer, even after it stops giv-ing milk, he added. Further, Kathiria said there will be objective-type questions, and the syllabus will be recom-mended on the website of the RKA. The exam results will be declared immediately and certificates will be given to all. Meritorious candidates will be

given prizes and certificates, he

The RKA chief also mentioned that it has received good response from varisities for setting up a chair and research centres on cow and related issues. The RKA, which comes under the Ministry of Fisheries. Animal Husbandry and Dairying, was set up by the Centre in February 2019, and is aimed at "conservation, protection and development of cows and their progeny".

Kamdhenu Aayog claims ayurveda treatment cured 800 **Covid-19 patients**

New Delhi: Rashtriya Kamdhenu Aayog (RKA) Chairman Vallabhbhai Kathiria on Tuesday claimed that 800 Covid-19 patients have been cured through 'panchgayya and ayurveda' treatment in a clinical trial conducted in four cities across the country. Kathiria said the clinical trials were conducted on 200 patients each in Rajkot and Baroda (Gujarat), Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh) and Kalyan (Maharashtra) between June and October 2020 in partnership with state governments and some NGOs. The treatment entailed doses of 'panchgavya' granules (mixture of cow urine, cow dung, milk, ghee and curd), herb 'Sanjeevani booti' and herbal concoction 'khada', he said. *PNS*

Farmers stand to lose rights to cultivate in their farms: Stalin

 $T^{\text{he DMK which launched}}_{\text{its campaign for the 2021}}$ Assembly election has made the contentious farm laws 2020 and allegations of corruption against Tamil Nadu against Tamil Nadu Government as its main chief, cautioned the people against the continuation of the Narendra Modi Government at the Centre and the Edappadi Palaniswamy Government in the State even for one day

"The Narendra Modi Government has taken away the rights of the farmers to cul-tivate in their own fields. The three farm legislations enacted by the Modi regime are against the farmers in the country. Hereafter the farmers will not be allowed to cultivate in their own lands. The Mandis and village markets operating all over India are being shut down. Even if the farmers cultivate in their fields, the crops would be taken away by corporates with the support of the Centre and State governments," warned Stalin while addressing Gram Cuddalore districts on Monday and Tuesday. The Grama Sabhas which

saw unprecedented crowds, mainly poor and marginal farmers, sat in rapt attention as the DMK chief told them about the traps laid by the Centre and State governments to 'dispossess them of their lands'. He said the BJP and the AIADMK were working exclusively to safeguard the interests of bigtime businessmen and corpo-

But farm experts in Tamil Nadu feigned ignorance about the possibilities listed out by the DMK president in his speech. "Though I read the new legis-lations threadbare and discussed about its pros and cons anything in the new laws which substantiate the allegations of Stalin," said R V Giri, president, CIFA (Confederation of Indian Farmers' Associations), an umbrella organization of farmers' unions in the country. Giri, himself a farmer, cultivating sugarcane in his ten-acre farm in Virudachalam, said that with the President signing the new Bill, he felt he was freed of the shackles of controls and regu lations. "Till now I could sell the sugarcane only to sugar factories which were handpicked by the Government, Now, I am at liberty to sell the crop to the buyer of my choice. Moreover Tamil Nadu has no Mandis to speak about and I do not know

what Stalin meant by these charges," Giri told *The Pioneer*. Farmer-turned-farm leader Pon Vijayaraghavan described Stalin's words as a bunch of lies. "He is spreading canard and falsehood. These were the same legislations which were under the consideration of the Congress for decades but the leaders were reluctant to get them converted into laws. Stalin has political intentions and that is why he is engaged in distorting the laws," said Vijayaraghavan, former Tamil Nadu chief of Kisan Morchcha.

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SC nod to makeover

Top court greenlights Govt's Central Vista project with caveats but will it be another symbolic ritual?



inally, India@75, the hashtag and slogan that's being touted as the Narendra Modi Government's crowning glory in perpetuating a new idea of nationhood, is a reality. For, its symbolic representation — a new Parliament building and a redone Central Vista — has received the Supreme Court's nod. Of course, the top court, while clearing the redevelopment initiative and settling questions regarding changed land use and environment compliance raised in a clutch of pleas, has put in several riders to avoid any runaway ambitions or creativity. It has clarified that the Government will

need the clearance of the Heritage Committee before beginning the project. But the fact that a dissenting judge in the three-member Bench expressed concerns about the Government's lack of public consultation doesn't quite assuage anxieties over the tampering with what is considered Delhi's cultural landmark and iconic identity. The Bench has even made smog towers mandatory as part of the construction process to keep pollution in check. And the Central Vista revamp is massive as it envisages a new triangular Parliament building with a seating capacity for 900 to 1,200 MPs and synergised administrative blocks, to be completed by August 2022. On its part, the Government has been arguing for a makeover of this part of Lutyens' Delhi for its functionality and efficiency, claiming that it would create spaces for a more streamlined operation of Ministry offices and free up more citizen-friendly spaces. But the purpose is entirely political, an attempt at rewriting history and concretising a political legacy. It is the Modi regime's attempt to overwrite our Colonial past and redesign an institution as wholly Indian, as representative of its people and epochmaking simply because no Government had thought of this before. Proponents of this line of thought cite examples of democracies overturning Colonial legacies, be it the Capitol building in the US or Australia's current Parliament building in Canberra, which opened in 1988 and became a source of Australian pride. They argue that as the world's most populous democracy, there needs to be a new sense of ownership about our institutions. Does that mean that we are doing away with all Colonialera markers and rituals, or simply making a point to show the transformative intent of a nava Bharat? In short, it is a power statement that overlays the Modi regime as a change-making moment in history which is, in fact, an expensive indulgence of political egoism than the Spartan commitment to our Constitution.

Yet, tradition has been sitting easily with modernity in Delhi, where each successive ruler lives through relics and monuments that have never overshadowed each other. Delhiites themselves have never denied heritage its place — Rajput, Islamic, European or Colonial — and made it a part of their living history, one where Lutyens' Delhi is a key chapter. There is no question of outdoing the elegance and classicism of design — the green pavilions, perches, cupolas and the islands are the only democratic spaces where citizens can move and roam around freely, catching the afternoon sun in the middle of winter and the gentle breeze of a summer evening. The cluster of offices would undoubtedly change the skyline as we know it and their ramped-up security would rob us of an indulgent spread in the heart of the city. Shouldn't the Government be wiser to leave a legacy of policy and governance instead of seeking a place-based identity? And shouldn't the Government be more concerned about upholding the dignity and respect for as well as independence of institutions in its pursuit of legacy? Prime Minister Narendra Modi doesn't quite like the "Lutyens' world" and the power structures and codes embedded in it. "I am a representative of the non-elite world. For me, everything is about the people of India," he had said earlier. But in the name of breaking elitism, one cannot justify point-scoring as a historical imperative. Or even the political economy it will generate — the project is expected to run into multi-crore tenders. There are fruits of preservation; they serve as reminders of what was and, as a reference point, help us learn lessons. There are no gains of demolition, forcibly reconstructing the past to suit our narrow ends. Given the secrecy around the makeover project, one hopes that the least the Government can do is to keep it transparent, consultative, reasonable and synchronise its character with the aspiration of Delhiites to be the citizens of a world heritage city. The city's application, which was submitted to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation in 2013, lists Lutyens' Bungalow Zone along with Shahjahanabad (old Delhi) as the rationale for seeking the tag. That sure will have a longer legacy than proving a point for the BJP's election manifesto in 2024.

Finding democracy

The United States will find it hard to sell democracy if its leaders can't fix their own



here are exactly two weeks to go before Joseph Biden is sworn in as the 46th President of the United States (US) on the steps of the US Capitol in Washington DC. His predecessor Donald Trump is, however, not giving up and recent revebout a phone call that he made to the Secretary of State in the US State of Georgia is as bizarre as it is frightening. In a recording made available to the US media outlets, Trump is heard asking the Georgia officials to "find" 11,780 votes so that he can overturn Biden's narrow win in that State. American constitutional and legal experts believe that Trump's phone call was inherently illegal and could land him in trouble once his presidency ends. The

45th President of the US, ironically the man who is trying to thwart democracy itself, sounds increasingly desperate when he proclaims that he would "fight like hell" to hold on to the presidency; the fact that all the 10 living former Defence Secretaries recently wrote in an Op-Ed that "the time for questioning the results has passed", notwithstanding. But as if matters were not bad enough, a whole host of US lawmakers and the Congress and Senate — many of whom owe their political careers to Trump — have said that they will try to delay the certification of the results. This despite the fact that Biden not only won enough US States to win the convoluted Electoral College, he also won a plurality of votes.

The 2020 US Election had the highest turnout in history and while Trump is right in claiming that he polled more votes than any incumbent US President in history, it was more a function of the higher turnout and an increased population. Biden won the popular vote by over seven million, having a margin of 4.4 per cent over Trump. Trump's attempts to overturn this election are a little different from the protestors' who cried "Not My President" when Trump won in 2016. Sowing the seeds of doubt on the electoral process, just like sore losers do in India when they blame the electronic voting machines, is the worst possible thing to do to build confidence in democracy. The US elections prove that it is a deeply divided country and Biden and his Vice-President Kamala Harris have a tough task uniting a country that talks in terms of 'Blue' States and 'Red' States. If the world is to look up to the US and not China. the 46th President has to be less divisive and become the Uniter-In-Chief.

Politicians of other hues joining the BJP begs the question if its ideology will be obscured. But, as history shows, there's no reason for such doubt

pprehensions have been expressed that the BJP's ideology will get mixed up, if not downright viti-ated, by the entry of politicians brought up in alien thought process es. The probability of such confusion is very low for the simple reason that most of the new members joining the BJP happen to be Hindus. There would, therefore, be no contradiction between their own private lives and what should be projected in their public life and political expression. In contrast, if a person like me were to join, say, the Revolutionary Socialist Party (RSP) at the age of 50, for a year of two. I would not know whether I am coming or going; it would be somewhat traumatic

I have been brought up in the belief of karma and, in the RSP, I would need to switch over and start having faith in a Permanent Revolution as preached by Leon Trotsky, Vladimir Lenin's favourite number two until he lived. This favourite leader wanted to go or with the revolution until he had converted the whole world to com-munism. If I read the *Das Kapital* the Bible of Marxism, I would come across the foundational tenet: From each according to his ability to each according to his need. These words are simple but the message behind them could take an average politician some exercise in mental diges-

A similar challenge had faced BR Ambedkar who had resolved that he would not like to die a Hindu. In that case, the question arose, which religion should he and his many followers convert to Babasahéb adopted the thinking method of reductio ad absurdum First, he took up Christianity and rejected it because it was of a foreign origin; it would, therefore, have a denationalising effect on his followers. Moreover, by having more Christians, Ambedkar felt that they would add to supporters of the British rulers. Islam also had a foreign origin; more Muslims could mean greater support to the creation of Pakistan. Thus reasoning, his eventual choice fell on Buddhism.

For politicians, joining the BJP is like coming home; what they should have politically believed in, and are now believing in. If they are committed to secularism, they can continue down that path. The question of Church and State being sep-arate or otherwise does not arise in the case of the Temple. Virtually every temple can follow its own ritual of worship; how can it then influence the Government? In any

case. Hinduism has never had a habit or tradition of dabbling in politics. State governance was the exclusive function of the ruler. But the fact is that since the early sun rose in the mists of time, the Indic ethos has been Hindu (or call it Sanatan or Vedic). That came through in the reasoning of Ambedkar as discussed above. Traditionally, in the West,

especially in America, the com-mon folk identified all Indians as Hindus and then enquired whether one was a Hindu Muslim or Hindu Christian or Hindu Hindu! To them, the sound of the word "India" first rang the bell of the American Red Indian. Some Nehruvians might have been embarrassed but, most of the time, the identity of India has been Hindu. The birth of Pakistan intensified this trend.
The Hindu Mahasabha was

founded in 1915, incidentally after the Muslim League was created by Lord Curzon in Dacca (now Dhaka) in 1906 after inducing Nawab Salimullah of Dacca with a loan of £1,00,000. The Bharatiya Jana Sangh came into being under the leadership of Syama Prasad Mookerjee in 1951. The Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) helped him with some full-time workers. In 1977, to fight the general elections immediately after the end of the Emergency, the Jana Sangh — like several other parties — merged with a new combine called the Janata Party. In 1980, the Jana Sanghis left this party to form the Bharatiya Jana Sangh; to start with, its manifesto was based around

Gandhian Socialism. The centre point of the party's ideology is "nation above all else". It is the anti-thesis of the

ipranationalist communism. The Islamic supremacy of the ummah above the nation is similarly disapproved. Care as much as possible but even socialism is not favoured as it contradicts the faith in karma as the decisive influence in life. The Hindu view of life sees a contradiction between liberty and equality; the latter causes levelling down of liberty to achieve it. How can

one control anyone's better karma? Welfare for all, yes, but forced equality, no.
Imperialism and the

exploitation of other countries are wrong. It is equivalent to robbery. Collective unity of one's own people in order to dominate others wrong. Instead, the Hindu blessings are with those who strive to actualise themselves and, thus, bring out the best in themselves. Killing of animals and birds is not desirable and the Jains, in particular, are sensitive to the destruction of even vege tation that is grown below the ground. The worship of the peepal tree is symbolic of the Hindu respect for ecology. Most of the ills that one sees are the result of centuries of rule by others over Hindustan

There is not a great deal of political or ideological literature. Nevertheless, Veer Savarkar first defined Hindutva or Hinduness in a single volume. It is valuable for those who wish to study the theoretical aspects of the ideology. After that, there is a volume called *The Saffron Book* and, it is reported, a book called *The* Grammar of Hindudom is under publication. It is noteworthy that it is the only ideology which is Asia's own, unlike all other political theories which are foreign or rather European.

Ideology is essentially Western phenomenon, just as political science is a European preoccupation. In sharp contrast, we in India have so far to our credit only two theses on this subject: One, the famous Arthashastra written more than 2,500 years ago; and the second, published only two years ago, titled *Krishna Rajya*. Hindu India had only one history book,

Rajatarangini, by Kashmiri scholar Kalhana, which again was

many centuries ago.
On the other hand, the European political parties are guided by their ideologies, which are many; beginning with com-munism on the extreme Left, to what is understood as fascism on the extreme Right. Take Britain, for example; only recently, Jeremy Corbyn was an extreme socialist. Earlier, there was Aneurin Bevan, who incidentally designed and implemented Britain's famous National Health Service. Harold Wilson, who was the Prime Minister, had the reputation of being a Leftist. Comparatively, Clement Attlee was a middle-ofthe-road politician while his contemporary Hugh Gaitskell was looked upon as a liberal. Yet, all these men belonged to the Labour Party.
On the Conservative Party

side, Sir Anthony Eden was a Rightist and went to war against Egypt in 1956 over the Suez Canal. Yet earlier, there was Enoch Powell who declared that rivers of blood will flow in England as a result of immigration". Later, Margaret Thatcher was a Right-winger and anti-socialist. Even fascism, considered Right extremism, did not spare British politics. Sir Oswald Mosley, a son-in-law of Lord Curzon, openly admitted to being a fascist. Despite all these differences in ideology, leaders even eminent ones - occasionally did change their parties. 

Stock markets in for a rough ride

The new year is full of hope. Investors expect this sentiment to be mirrored on the bourses but they might end up being disappointed

ne year 2020 was one of lost lives, livelihoods, businesses and shattered economies. However, the new year has brought the hope that the march of the virus would be contained through mass inoculation and result in the global economy recovering from the onslaught of the contagion. Usually, fiscal recovery is led by a revival in the stock markets and the bourses show improvement much before the actual economic upturn. This is because stock prices are forward-looking and investors buy scrip based on their expectations of the future and not on past data or present information. So what do the bourses have in store for us this year?

Both the benchmark indices, Nifty 50 and the BSE Sensex, started the year with a bang, ending on record highs with Nifty 50 ending above the 14,000 mark and the BSE Sensex above the 48,800 levels. The sentiment was boosted by the expectation of economic revival. So, will the markets continue to rise further? Since the pandemic broke out in India at the end of March 2020, the Nifty 50 rose to double its level from 7,500 to above 14,000 as on January 1. In the US, the NASDAQ Composite index, too, rose from the $7{,}000\,$ range in March 2020 to almost touch the 13,000 mark on the last day of the year. Nikkei 225, the benchmark index of Japan too, showed the same trend and gained 66 per cent to reach the 27,444 mark at the end of the year. This worldwide phenomenon of continuous stock market rise during the most difficult times in living memory shows that the bourses have already incorporated and priced in the news of positive results of the COVID-19 vaccination and earnings revival

A trendline typically confirms the direction of the market by connecting the troughs and the peaks. An upward trend connects all the troughs and creates a support line. The strength of this upward trend and the support line is tested by the numerous times it is able to stop a price breach. Historically, looking at the last 10 years, there has been an overall primary uptrend in the Niftv 50 from the level of 2,700 in 2009 to 12,000 in January 2020, with minor secondary downturns in 2010-2011 and 2015-2016. After a steep drop in March 2020 Nifty 50 started another untrend which lasted the entire year At the current levels of above 14,000, the sentiment still remains bullish and there is a strong possibility of the markets moving past 14,500 in the near future. However, the upward trend during the last year shows that all the positive news about economic revival have already been reflected in the prices. On the downturn, Nifty may find support levels in the range of 11,000-13,000.
Options are considered information channels for the markets,

which eventually result in stock price changes. As options markets are the preferred trading markets for informed investors, volume and open interest play an important role as predictive tools to forecast the movement of the underlying stocks as they can develop an early earning mechanism for any market crisis. They also represent the strength and potential of price change of the underlying asset. Therefore, an important indicator to consider is the put-call options volume ratio.

This contrarian-sentiment investment measure is one of the most important tools to predict the market's direction by tracking the daily and weekly volume of puts and calls in the stock market and gauging the sentiments of the investors. Puts are generally bought as an insurance against a market decline, whereas calls are bought as a directional bet for bullish markets. So when put volume increases, expectation of the market decline increases and when call volume increases, expectation of market uptrend increases. The putcall ratio for the options in Nifty with various expiry dates from January to February this year is increasing steadily, from 1.17 for Nifty options expiring on January 7 to two for Nifty options expiring on February 4. This shows that the put options volume is steadily increasing, showing a possibility of a short-term downtrend.

The new year is full of expectation of positivity and hope. Investors expect this sentiment to be reflected in the stock markets but they have to understand that bourses are leading indicators and last year's rally has already incorporated the economic revival. The uptrend may continue till the 14,000-15,000 levels. However, these levels have a psychological barrier and we may see a market correction soon. Support levels can come in the range of 11,000-13,000. The new year may not see just an uptrend but would also witness some profit booking. Any downtrend due to profit booking could be an opportunity for people to invest for the long-term. This year could also see increased earnings as most of the companies were able to reduce their operating costs last year during the pandemic. This may help them to increase their earnings this year. A revival of earnings would go a long way in improving stock market returns. Overall, there is hope for economic revival this year. However, since the information has already been reflected in the stocks last year, this year the markets may see a bumpy ride.

Much ado about NPAs

There might be a delay, some re-scheduling or loan restructuring may be required but eventually the bank will get its money back with interest. There is no need to panic

s we step into the new decade, the woes of the last decade seem to have spilled over into the new one, especially where the beleaguered banking sector is concerned. According to the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI's) estimates, the Gross Non-Performing Assets (GNPAs) of banks may increase from 8.5 per cent in March 2020 to 12.5 per cent by March this year. For public sector banks (PSBs), the deterioration is estimated to be more problematic and the GNPAs could be anywhere between 11.3 to 15.2 per cent under the "baseline scenario." Some Cassandras warn that the official scenario. Cassandras warn that the situation could be worse Their relentless scaremongering could potentially hurt economic revival that requires a major increase in bank lending.

In December 2020, scheduled commercial banks had total outstanding deposits of

₹145,91,773 crore while their outstanding loans and advances added up to only ₹105,04,536 crore. A bank's primary function is to lend against deposits and earn enough to make profits after servicing deposits. Data show that banks have enough money to lend more and they must be helped to give more loans. However, a lot of good borrowers are out of the banking net. Banks no doubt face certain risks especially in the prevailing situation due to the pandemic but there is no need to panic. But first, we need to answer the question, what is an NPA? For a bank, an NPA is the amount of loan or an advance for which repayment of any due instalment of principal or due amount of interest is not cleared within 90 days of the "due date." Interestingly, for agricultural loans it is "within two crop seasons for short duration crops" or within "one crop season for

If default of payment continues beyond one year of the due date, the NPA is called "Substandard Assets." If a NPA default continues beyond two years of the due date the NPA is called "Doubtful Assets." If auditors find that the NPA is due to an incurable default, they classify it as "Loss Assets." Does anyone expect a business to always make a profit? The answer is an emphat-ic "no." Because this is an unrealistic expectation and every business will face a loss or just about break even, many times in its years of existence. This is because how a company makes its money depends a lot on external factors. Likewise, lending is also a business and a bank always runs the risk of a loan or a part of it or the interest not coming in. A bank hoping to lend money only to safe borrowers will not run for long because 100 per cent safe borrowers generally don't need to take loans or are disinclined to do so. Past efforts for resolution of Stressed Assets

react entries for resolution of stressed Assets seemed to be showing results because, after reaching a peak of 11.5 per cent at the end of March 2018, the GNPAs of scheduled commercial banks came down to 8.5 per cent by the end of March 2020. So the first thing to note before resorting to scaremongering is that more than 90 per cent of bank loans and advances are being serviced with additional control of the scare viced with a delay of 90 days at the most. It does not mean that the remaining bank loans where debt servicing is delayed beyond 90 days are a dead loss for banks because they have enough securities to cover most of these balance loans suf-fering from problems in debt servicing.

As a pandemic relief measure, all borrowers whose loan accounts were classified as standard as on February 29, 2020, were allowed a mora-

torium till August 31. This was done to ensure that this period was not counted in the 90 days' default period and was not classified as an NPA account.

The Supreme Court had in September 2020 directed that no bank account should be declared an NPA until the disposal of pleas seeking an extension of the moratorium period. The final verdict on this is expected

What perhaps escapes attention is that the concerns regarding NPAs or bad loans in popular parlance are exaggerated due to the conservative approach of the RBI. Banks are told to classify loans as performing or non-performing only on the basis of timely repayments of loans and interest, even when there is no erosion in the availability and value of the security or net worth of the borrower/guarantor.

The 90 days' default rule to tag a loan account as an NPA is a rough and ready, easy to implement, blunt regula-tory tool. It indicates an income impairment of the borrower or liquidity risk but certainly not solvency risk. The "income impaired" borrower may or may not be "asset impaired." Therefore, if we create a new subclass of NPAs based on the 90-day rule, with an assessment of solvency risk, then it should be possible to refine capital adequacy norms and evolve a differential capital adequacy requirement for NPAs where underlying securities are not materially impaired. Betting on the banking sec-tor's NPA level once the loan moratorium is lifted amounts to betting on the extent of the pandemic's impact on economic growth and on the incomes of borrowers. Such betting is not economic growth and in the particular in the particu ics or mathematics but politics.

If the banks have enough security behind the loan they have given out (house, vehicle, gold, shares, bonds and

so on) and the borrowers are not all crooks, the loans will be serviced. There might be some delay, some rescheduling or loan restructuring required, but eventually the bank will get its money back, with interest. There is no need to press the panic button. Heavens will not fall merely because some loans, interest or equated month-ly instalments (EMIs) are not paid within 90 days of the due date

The Government and the RBI have to take some steps to see that the loans and advances of good borrowers are properly restructured and the debt recovery process becomes efficient in terms of time and value recovered. Banks need to raise additional capital to meet regulatory requirements, depending upon what kind of NPAs emerge. Banks also need liquidity support to service the deposits during the period the borrowers face liquidity problems but have sufficient assets to

cover their loan liability. Every code and every rule book has enabling clauses to deal with exceptional situations. Rules of normal times don't apply in abnormal times. The pandemc is the time to invoke these exceptional powers to fine-tune the regulatory policy on recognition of a bad loan and the level of additional capital needed by banks to cover definite loss from irrecoverable loans due to the lack and

osion of underlying securities. The impact of the contagion on the economy is temporary and low inflation has softened what would have otherwise been a harder blow. Assessments and perceptions about population segment-wise distribution of pain may vary according to commentators but it is abundantly clear that at an aggregate level, the nation will recover from the crisis fast enough. A high recovery and low fatality rate, fast resumption of economic activity in several sectors, both formal and informal, as evidenced by several high frequency indicators, are

several high frequency indicators, are very good signs. Hence, loan servicing will happen albeit with some delay. By and large, Indian banks are pretty conservative and most of the loans are heavily secured, backed by good valuable securities. The problem comes in enforcing the security because the legal system does not allow it so easily. What we need is a system of vigilance and diligence on the assets mortgaged for the loans and advances. The genuineness and continued existence of assets must be watched and digital tools can be deployed for this.

There is no harm in giving borrow-ers providing adequate security an extended moratorium. But what we need is a system that will protect the banks' securities during the moratori-um period so that these are not diluted or alienated or encumbered further. We require a robust system of oversight on these securities. This is particularly so for small borrowers below ₹2 crore who have been helped by the Government based on the Rajiv Mehrishi Committee report

In India, the credit-to-GDP ratio is just 50 per cent. Many good borrowers like households and businesses depend on informal channels of finance. Indian banks are not lending enough and they are being far too risk-averse. Banks need to use modern digital tools to improve loan surveillance and lend more by using digital technologies to improve credit product design, pre-sanction appraisal and post-sanction oversight on end use. This will help boost the economy of the country in the long run.

Time to give a modern touch to an ancient skill

As a first step, professional institutes like the ITIs, polytechnics, NIFT and NID can start imparting training in khadi and handloom clusters

⊣he Uttar Pradesh (UP) Government's decision to include a *khadi* fashion show in UP Day celebrations is recognition of the sector's role in inclusive development and its employment potential. Khadi and handloom fabrics are as integral to our cultural heritage as zari is to a trousseau. The Rigveda, the Mahabharata and the Ramayana expound upon the art of spinning and weaving. Woven cloth, bone needles and spindles were found in Mohenio-Daro and Harappa. Block-printed fabrics, mainly of Gujarati origin, discovered in Egyptian tombs, exhibit the demand of Indian cotton textiles abroad and their export since the 19th century B.C. This tradition of excellence has been preserved by genera-tions of skilled artisans and weavers. Today, the khadi-handloom sector employs over four million weavers and allied production workers. The textile sector is the second-largest employer after agriculture in India. However, the 2010 Handloom Census revealed that the number of weavers was declining at a rate of seven per cent per annum, the count of handlooms was dwindling and a weaver earned a meagre ₹3,400 per month as against the all India average of ₹4,500 per month for any other worker. With the next generation being sceptical and disinterested in the craft, the Indian handloom industry is on the verge of becoming extinct.

The need of the hour is to segre gate the sector into subsectors and work on the strengths of each. India occupies an enviable place in the world as 85 per cent of the global handloom production occurs in the country. Other handloom producing nations like Sri Lanka, Nepal, Bangladesh, Cambodia and Indonesia manufacture a very limited range of products,

which is mainly for domestic use. India has the capability to meet the demand for handmade products across the globe due to its demographic advantage and cultural heritage. We need to align our rich legacy with the demands of the modern era by incorporating latest designs. A Benarasi or Chanderi weaver can earn more if s/he contemporises the sari and diversifies into exportable accessories like stoles, scarves, ties, belts, bags and so on. This product development calls for a strong collaboration between weavers and designers. Another crucial dimension in the value chain is marketing, that needs to be understood, appreciated and exploited. Premium handloom products like the Patan Patola Baluchari, Jamdani, Ikat and Kani need to be projected as niche products. With their unique designs and distinct weaving techniques, they should be targeted only at the affluent so that weavers get high returns.

However, this strategy is intended only for highly skilled weavers with whom designers associate. They constitute only 20 per cent of the hand-

loom weavers who produce 80 per cent of the high-value items. The remaining 80 per cent of the weavers would need to be dealt with differently

Handloom textiles face a serious threat in the marketplace when pow-erloom cloth is clandestinely sold as handloom. As a layman cannot distinguish a powerloom product from handloom, the Handloom Mark is a guarantee to the buyer that the prod-uct is genuinely handwoven. However, there is a need to generate awareness among the people about the Handloom Mark. Something as sim-ple as a one-line commercial during the daily soaps on television could be instrumental in enlightening the target group. Plus, only products carrying the Handloom Mark should be exhibited at Government-sponsored exhibitions in India and abroad. Apart from raising awareness, this would also ensure that only genuine handloom weavers derive benefit from the sales at such expos and Government

However, we must not lose sight of the fact that the sector provides direct and indirect employment to over four million people, all of whom cannot be trained immediately to make intricate, high-end products. They are the durrie makers, the gamchha and towel manufacturers They need Government support of a different kind. Apart from reservation of articles for production only on hand-looms, they need subsidised yarn and credit. Credit is available to the sector at six per cent interest rate. If implemented in earnest, this can provide the much-needed working capital to spinners and weavers, apart from helping them in putting up facilities for dyeing, processing and finishing of handspun and handwoven fabric. The Hank Yarn Obligation makes it mandatory for spinning mills to pro-duce certain percentage of their yarn in the hank form required for hand-looms. The need is to strengthen the implementation machinery and ensure effective enforcement in the field so that every producer who manufactures yarn for powerloom or mill consump tion, packs at least 30 per cent of that in hank form.

If small units in the sector have to take up spinning and weaving on a commercial scale, this would require modification of the workstations. They should be ergonomically designed to produce more and better quality threads and fabrics at a faster pace. They should be modular, easy to assemble and transport. A solar pow ered spinning wheel is the need of the hour. A semi-automatic loom could be a good solution wherein the motive ower is provided by the weaver manually and various other motions are synchronised to obtain better speed and productivity. These could also be coupled with an automatic take-up and let-off mechanism. Technological innovations can create new possibilities for design development and the production process. There is a strong need for focused incentive schemes towards *khadi* and handloom research

For both couture and mass producers, there is a need to generate a sense of pride with the occupation. Hand spinning as well as weaving needs to be treated as a modern pro-

fession. As a first step, professional institutes like Industrial Training Institutes, polytechnics, the National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT) and the National Institute of Design (NID) can start imparting training in *khadi* and handloom clusters. A NIFT or NID certificate will instill a sense of pride apart from upgrading skills of weavers and spinners. Acquiring these standardised, employable and marketable skills will earn them due recognition in the job market and society. In a world increasingly inclined towards standardisation and mass production, khadi and handloom provide a refreshing change because of their uniqueness, flexibility and versatility. The sector represents the country's traditional craft that has been patronised and promoted since times immemorial. We must never forget that the sector has been sustained by transferring skills from one gener-ation to another and it is crucial to keep Gen Next in the profession.

"I hope Mike Pence comes through for us, I have to tell you," Trump said at a rally Monday night in Georgia for candidates in two Senate runoff

"Of course, if he doesn't come through, I won't like him quite as much," Trump added, drawing laughs. He said Pence was "going to have a lot to say about it. And you know one thing with him, you're going to get straight shots. He's going to call it straight."

Pence has spent hours huddling with the president, staff and the Senate parliamentarian. His office declined to discuss his plans heading into Wednesday's count. But people close to the vice president stressed his respect for institu-tions and said they expect him to act in accordance with the law and hew to the Constitution.

"I think he will approach this as a constitutionalist, basically, and say, 'What's my role in the Constitution as president of the Senate?" said David McIntosh, president of the conservative Club for Growth and a Pence friend.

Trump, Constitution training, combat readiness

Beijing: Chinese President Xi Jinping has asked the military to strengthen training to hone its combat skills and remain on high alert as the new revised defence law expanding the powers of the armed forces came into force from this year.

The 67-year-old leader, who also heads the ruling Chinese Communist Party (CCP) besides the Central Military Commission (CMC) -- the overall high command of the two million strong military signed the commission's first order for 2021, which listed priorities in the training of the People's Liberation Army (PLA) and the People's Armed Police Force (PLAF), official media here reported on Tuesday.

The order instructed the armed forces to stick to Xi Jinping Thought on Socialism with Chinese Characteristics for a New Era as their guiding principle and uphold Xi Jinping Thought on Strengthening the Military as well as military

strategies in the new era.

It said the CCP will enhance its guidance over the military's training, urging the armed forces to focus on improving their combat readiness and continuing to reform their training system, state-run China Daily reported.

issued in January 2018, when Xi addressed a massive training and commencement ceremony at a shooting range in northern China.

According to the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post, Xi said the PLA must be ready to "act at any sec-ond" as the armed forces kicked off the year's military training and exercises on Monday.

"(The PLA must) increase the integration of new equipment, new forces and new combat realms into training and combat systems," the report said, quoting the Chinese president. *PTI*

Former head of **China state** asset firm gets death sentence

Beijing: The former head of state-owned China Huarong Asset Management Co Ltd was sentenced to death on Tuesday for bribe taking in one of the harshest punishments for economic crimes in recent years.

Lai Xiaomin, 58, was also found guilty by the Second Intermediate People's Court of Tianjin of lesser charges includ-ing corruption and bigamy.

Life sentences and suspended death sentences com-muted to life after two years are frequently handed down in corruption cases, but death sentences without the chance of reprieve have become rare in recent years. Such sentences are automatically appealed to China's highest court.

Lai was placed under inves-tigation by the ruling Communist Party's corruption watchdog in 2018 and expelled from the party later the same year. In its ruling, the Tianjin court cited the "especially enor-mous" size of the bribes Lai accepted, saying they exceeded 600 million yuan (\$93 million) in one instance.

In total, it said Lai collected or sought to collect 1.79 billion vuan (\$260 million) over a decade in exchange for abusing his position to make invest ments, offer construction contracts, help with promotions and provide other favours. AP

Pak SC orders reconstruction of vandalised Hindu temple reported.

Islamabad: Pakistan's Supreme Court on Tuesday ordered the Evacuee Property Trust Board (EPTB) to start reconstruction of a century-old Hindu temple that was vandalised and set on fire by a mob in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province last week, saying the attack has caused "international embarrassment" to the country.

The apex court, which took notice of the attack and ordered the local authorities to appear before the court on January 5, also directed the board to submit in court details of all functional and non-functional temples and gurdwaras across Pakistan, Dawn newspaper encroachments.

The attack on the temple in Terri village in Khyber Pakhtunkhwas (KP) Karak district on Wednesday by members of radical Jamiat Ulemae-Islam party (Fazal ur Rehman group) drew strong condemnation from human rights activists and the minority

Hindu community leaders. During the hearing on Tuesday, a three-member bench headed by Chief Justice Gulzar Ahmed also directed the EPTB to clear encroachments from temples across the country and take action against officials involved in the

A pproval of the long-await-ded Covid-19 vaccine provides strength to the optimism on health and economic fronts, the Finance Ministry said in its monthly economic report.

"The effective management of COVID-19 spread despite the festive season and onset of the winter season, combined with sustained improvement in high-fre-quency indicators and Vshaped recovery along with easing of lockdown restric-tions distinguish Indian economy as one riding against the COVID-wave," the report said.

The new year, it said, has dawned with the approval of the long-awaited COVID-19 vaccine and initiation of vaccination drives in various coun-

tries.
"This gives strength to the optimism on both health and economic fronts despite continuing surge in global cases and the potential challenge of a mutant strain," the Monthly

Economic Review for December said.

India, the report said, "has been successful in bending the COVID-curve till now, with reducing weekly/daily infections, rising recovery rate (now at around 95 per cent) and one of the world's lowest case fatal-

ity rates". The downside risk, however, remains due to the spread of the UK variant and fatigue from social distancing guide-lines, it said, adding the emphasis on continued observation of 'COVID appropriate' behaviour with the due exercise of caution and surveillance needs to be sustained.

Sharing improvement in some of the high-frequency data, the report said the sustained spurt in commercial and industrial activity was further corroborated by continued growth in PMI manufacturing, power demand, persistent improvement in E-way bills generated and highway toll collection rising above pre-COVID levels.

Realty firms may witness margin shrink by 4-6% due to steel price rise

Surge in prices of steel products That are used in the construction sector has an adverse impact on the real estate companies as these entities are now not in a position to pass the additional cost on their buyers and may witness shirking of margin by 4-6 per cent, realtors said on Tuesday.

The steel prices have increased at a time when demand for property is slowly getting back on the track with the government measures and low interest-rate regime, they said.

Real estate industry body Credai Bengal president Nandu Belani said the spurt in steel prices will reduce the margin by 4-5 per cent, which is quite high for the sector.

Anticipate and adapt

iven our present situation, the future of education isn't as dramatic nor so dark to predict. However, before we dive into the future, it is imperative to revisit how education has evolved over time.

Even before the transition into the industrial revolution, education has always been delivered within closed quarters. Initially, due to the lack of access to formalised schooling and higher education institutions, patriarchs transferred all knowledge and skills to their kin, while values and culture were delivered by religious figure heads.
To this effect, the family-sir-

name evolved, attributed to the kind of work a family or a community did for a living. Thus, a social routine — a belief, culture, and value: was established.

Next came the Industrial Revolution — the age of mechanisation; involving machines, processes and men, advocating to work in a controlled environment in a controlled way determined by the factory-settings. Industry reset the status quo as it demanded a fresh new outlook and skill-per-

spectives.

Most universities will implement technological solutions to be deeply linked, networked and in sync to offer a more robust future and industry ready student, which considering current circumstances and uncertainty is required more

Universities will integrate and link with industries, research insti-tutions and digital platforms to offer courses and programmes — offering in a phased wise flexible graduation timelines that happen through credit accumulation. ■What is the future of edtech sector

There are certain truths that won't likely change for the next 10-20 years. Core education will continue to be offered in schools but schools will look and act very different. There will be far greater permeation of systems and technology to make schools run effectively. Till about 12 years of age, mediated learning (learning assisted by a trust-ed adult) will continue thus teachers will continue to play an important role till high school but they will need to be enabled by technology. Going forward, learning will become more and more personalised. This personalisation will happen on the dimension of speed of understanding, interest in different subjects and language of instruction.

How do you see the new academic year for students?

The new academic year will signal return to normalcy in terms of time-lines. Schools in North and CBSE schools can go back to beginning their academic year in April 2021 whereas schools in West and South can start academic year in June. But when schools re-open, there might be still some parents who are hesitant to send their children to school. Schools should imple ment hybrid systems that enable both in-school and at-home learning, both in-class and online learning.

What is something that schools

should do/ can be done when schools reopen post covid?

Before opening, there has to be a massive confidence building and awareness building drive among parents and the wider community. Schools should put in place measures for student safe-ty, student well-being and hybrid learning. These should be communicated to parents via a dialogue. Parents should be given a choice and those who choose to keep their students at home, should have an option for at-home learning while understanding the limitations of this choice.

■What can be done to curb the anxieties of the parents of class 10th stu-dents who will be writing their board exams?

The way our education system is

currently structured, Class X still plays a disproportionate role on a child's future. Thus it is necessary that over the

against both pace and spin.

The decision on the third pacer has been primarily delayed because on Tuesday, the SCG centre strip was covered due to overcast conditions.

On Wednesday, a look at the strip and the conditions will probably help them make a decisive choice

If the conditions are overcast and there is bit more moisture on the strip, then Thakur is expected to be pre-

If the track is on the flatter side, Saini, with his pace and ability to reverse the old ball, could prove to be a handful against a batting order that is struggling to put up even 200 runs on the board.

If Saini plays, it will be his debut in the longest format while for Thakur, it would be like a debut as he couldn't ever

Both Warner and Pukovski who was primed for Test debut in Adelaide, missed the first two Tests of the series due to a groin injury and concussion-related issues respectively.

"Very hopeful that David

will be ready to go (for the third Test), he is a bit of a warrior, isn't he? I have said this since day one that he is doing everything possible to be ready," Langer said at a virtual media conference.

"He is moving pretty well. He is very determined to play. He loves the competition and he loves playing Test cricket. We will get some final eyes on him at training this afternoon and we will make a discussion on that. But I would say, he (Warner) is looking very likely to play the Test match," he added.

Langer also announced that 22-year-old Pucovski, who was hit on the head during the warm up game against India A,

has been cleared to play.
"He has been cleared by all the medicos. He has been cleared and that will be very heartening for him and for his family and everyone involved in it," Langer said.

Langer sought to allay con-cerns that Warner hasn't played four-day cricket for about 12 months, saying the immense experience that is behind the opener will help him jump into traditional format without any

fuss.
"He has played a lot of white-ball cricket recently, a bit like Steve Smith. *Davey* hasn't played any four-day cricket for about 12 months but he is a master of the game. He has played

that," said Langer.

The coach said they will keep Warner in the slips to help him save energy though he may feel some discomfort while field-

"He is going to play with pain though and it is not so much in the muscle but in the tendon area. Like (a) lot of cricketers, who play through dif-ferent levels of pain, he is willing to take that on and hopefully won't hamper him too much," he added.

Warner had himself last Saturday said he was "highly doubtful" about attaining full fit-ness ahead of the third Test, though he would possibly do respond to a desperate selection

and team management's call. However, Langer assured that if the Australians felt that there was any risk of re-injuring Warner, then they would have certainly not rushed his return.
"He has had a good rehab,

South Africa won by 10 wickets after Sri Lanka were bowled out for 211 in their second innings. Set to make 67 runs to win, the hosts sealed their victory half an hour after lunch.

Karunaratne, the Sri Lankan captain, made 103 after starting the day on 91. His dismissal started a collapse in which Sri Lanka lost their last six wickets for 35 runs. Lungi Ngidi took 4/44 and fellow fast bowler Lutho Sipamla ripped through the tail to take 3/40.

Karunaratne and Niroshan Dickwella started brightly after Sri Lanka resumed on 150/4 Karunatne went to a 123-ball century with two successive off-side boundaries off Anrich Nortje but an attempted pull off the same bowler looped off a top

edge to backward square leg. Ngidi followed up with the wicket of Dickwella in the next over when a leading edge carried to mid-off and there was minimal resistance from the rest of the batting.

Aiden Markram batted

aggressively at the start of the final innings but escaped when he edged a loose drive against Vishwa Fernando with his score on 14 in the last over before lunch. Kusal Mendis dived forward from second slip and appeared to take a good catch but a television review showed he had taken the ball on the

Markram finished on 36 not out while Dean Elgar followed up his 127 in the first innings with 31 not out. Player of the Series Elgar made 253 runs in the series and was only dismissed twice
