Kafan demand rises by 30 fold

Covid deaths keep looms running round the clock

There are things one takes for granted, like the cloth used to cover a body. Not any longer. The 'Kafan' (shroud), generally a thick, white, unstitched piece of cloth, is suddenly dearer. It is on account of the unusual spike in the number of deaths owing to Covid-19. More people are buying the cloth to drape their dear ones on their final journey.

In Bihar ad Uttar Pradesh, small handloom and machine loom units are busy making bolts of "kafan'. The production has been ramped up to meet the surge in demand. While these units produced 10,000 individual pieces of the shounds a month, they are coping with the demand for a similar number every day. That's not it. They need to be cut to size, packed and transported as fast as possible.

An official of the Handlooms and Textile Department of Uttar Pradesh said that the demand of one lakh "kafan" per month man-

Underlining a factor of class divide, the official said as the making of the product is not a profitable one, it is most-ly confined to areas where cheap labour is available, like in Bihar. UP and West Bengal.

the Manchester of eastern Bihar and the workers here are doing overtime to meet the demand for about 50,000 "kafan" per

for about 50,000 "kafan" per day for adjoining areas and other States. Besides cotton, the units from here also make shrouds out of polyester and silk.

"We have been working round the clock. Pained to make bolts of kafan. The demand is high, but we have been supplying with full integrity and at same price as earlier. No black marketing for this product," said Dwarika,

Cyclone claims 8 lives, inoculation drive suspended in coastal areas

The anti-Covid inoculation drive in most parts
of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa, Kerala,
Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu was affected on
sunday due to the cyclonic storm Tauktae' that
displaced thousands of people and claimed
eight lives so far.

Keeping in view of India Meteorological
Departments' warning, most of the coastal
regions in these states suspended the drive for two
days-Sunday and Monday.

The inoculation was suspended for two days

north Konkan, Thane, Ratnagiri districts in
Maharashtra, Gujarat has also suspended the
drive for two days. The drive was also affected
in Kerala, Goa, Tamil nadu, Gujarat and

The Government has asked all the leading hospitals in harshand to set up post-Covid harshand to set up ost-Covid harshand to set up ost-Covid casting infrastructure for rehabilitation of Covid survivors following a rise in cases of Covid-induced Mucormycosis and fatalities caused by residual symptoms.

In a letter addressed to four State-run hospitals and the general managers of Tata Main Hospital in Jamshedpur and Bokaro General Hospital, the Government stated that in mendation of the Expert Committee of CoVID-19 Management, all the hospitals are directed to set up post-covid care facilities for management, treatment and counselling of Covid survivors without further delay.

In the letter addressed to the hospitals on Saturday



evening, the Government has also asked them to appoint nodal officers for management of post-Covid care facilities. "The arrangements should be made in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare for post-Covid coun-selling and treatment," the let-ter stated.

Even after the first wave of Covid-19 last year, the gov-

ernment had directed state-run hospitals to set up post-Covid care facilities. At present, there is a functional post-Covid care facility at the Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS) in

Rebels are unable to procure medicines, oxygen and other supplies due to heavy presence of security forces and anti-naxal operations. They are managing somehow by arranging home isolation medicine kits supplied by the Jharkhand government among people.

The National Jal Jeevan Mission (NJJM) has asked all States and Union Territories (UTs) to roll out sensor-based loT solutions to measure and monitor water supply in rural areas, so as to ensure water service delivery in rural homes by addressing various issues that cause disruption on a regular basis.

In a statement, the Jah Shakti Ministry said: India has one of the most vibrant Internet of Things (107) eco-systems in the world, with various supporting enablers making it conducive for companies seeking to serve the global demand beyond national boundaries. The Government of India has introduced a number of initiatives to leverage the benefits of these disruptive IoT technologies in multiple sectors."

To utilise this expertise, the NJJM, and the Ministry had set up a Technical Expert Committee to prepare a road map for measurement and monitoring of water service delivery systems in the rural areas. The committee has eminent members from academia, administration, technology and specialists from the water supply sector.

It may be recalled that on April 28, the number of daily deaths breached the threshold of 1,000 in Maharashtra to reach the figure of 1035, which has been the highest-ever number of deaths recorded since the breast was the state of the state deaths recorded since the break out of Covid-19 in March-April last year. The daily tally on that day was a consolidated figure that had included 50 earlier deaths which had earlier not been accounted.



rials for producing the vaccines.

The last two types of supplies were tagged along with the free doses supplied The vaccine diplomacy of New Delhi, called "Vaccine Main", began on January 21 and lasted till April 16. In this period, India had supplied abroad all the vaccine it possibly could and the rationale for this comes from no less a person than Prime Minister Narendra Modi himself. At the inaugural Raisina Dialogue on April 13, he said: "...this year, despite many constraints, we have supplied vaccine to over 80 countries. We know that the supplies have been modest. We know that the demands are huge. We know that it will be a long time before the entire humanity can be vaccinated. At the same time, we also know that hope matters." During this period, doses were sent to 95 countries across the world. Now comes the part where the Government did not do what it was supposed to do during this period of "Maitri". On May 11, the cumulative doses given to Indians stood at 17.51 crore and no more orders were placed in this period even though shortages were being reported. In early May, the Government said it was still to receive 23 million doses from its previous order and placed fresh orders of around 160 million doses. These orders, for May, June and July, are supposed to be met by July. The manufacturers have their own compul-sions meeting the orders in time and the vaccination drive awaits vaccines, free or

FIRST COLUMN SHOULD YOU COUNT ON MUTUAL FUNDS?

Research shows that past returns and the age of the mutual fund have an impact on your savings

utual funds are gaining popularity as a preferred investment avenue among Indians over the last decade. Particularly over the last five years, the industry has witnessed a huge increase in the number of folios which grew to 44.2 million from March, 2014 to June, 2019. What makes this growth interesting is the fact that it had largely come from the segment of individual investors, including both retails investors and high networth individuals (HNIs). This segment registered a growth rate of 15.5 percent during this period, which in turn contributed to a 27 percent fise in assets under management (AUM) of individual investors from 24 lakh crore in June, 2019. Since mutual funds have become one of the preferred investment destinations or investor, it is impor-

one of the preferred investment destinations or investor, it is impor-tant to choose funds that will perform better than others. One of the ways in which the performance of mutual funds is measured is through net inflows and outflows, which is the net result of the total money that has moved into and moved out of the fund for a particular time period. If the end result is positive, indicating



inflows, it means that more money has been invested into the funds and vice versa. Net flows are important as they provide the performance report of mutual funds. High net inflows are significant as they lead to higher AUM, which in turn increase company's profits. On the other hand, high net outflows, might lead to some tactical changes like changing the fund manager or the investment philosophy. Increase in the collective net inflows also leads to increase in the size of some individual mutual funds and also the size of the mutual fund funds also the size of the mutual fund industry as a whole. In addition, net flows can also provide an insight into the general collective predictive capacity of investors. So, an over-all net inflow into any mutual fund may forecast its positive perfor-nance. So, if net flows are so important for any mutual fund, what determines that it gets positive inflows? Research shows that factors like past returns, the age of the mutual fund, higher expenses like higher advertising costs, lower fees and size of the fund family. Some strategic decisions, like changing the name of the mutual fund to match the current season trend also bring in extra inflows. Size plays an import role in the performance of mutual funds.

Several studies suggest that younger or new funds have higher per-formance as they enter the industry with higher skill sets and their relatively smaller exposure to market makes sure that any adverse market movements would have less impact on the performance. In addition, the increasing size of the industry also has an adverse impact on the performance. The larger the industry size, the lesser is the potential of any profitable trades, as adjustments to any anomalies, which may lead to any profit making, quickly happen, leading to less

chances of booking profits.

Skill of the fund and the fund manager are an important determinant of mutual fund performance. Fund managers' compensation also contributes its performance. In cases where the compensation depends on performance, such mutual funds, due to an active strategy, end up generally becoming high performance funds and per-form better than funds where managers use passive fund manage-ment style. So, a fund manager's skill in stock picking helps in gen-erating a higher return.

Several studies show a predictive pattern of mutual fund analysis based on the above discussed determinants. Small investors should take advantage and make use of the skills of the funds and fund mangers to beat the benchmark and hope to generate higher returns.

Sharks use Earth's magnetic field as a GPS, scientists say

Portland: Sharks use the Earth's magnetic field as a sort of natural GPS to navigate journeys that take them great distances across the world's occans, scientists have found. Researchers said their marine laboratory experiments with a small species of shark confirm hong-held speculation that sharks use magnetic fields and observed in other marine nimital such as sea turtles. Their study, published this month in the journal Current Biology, also shoeld light on why sharks are able to traverse seas and find their way back to feed, bread and give birth, said marine policy specialist Bryan Keller, one of the study authors. "We didn't know that sharks can respond to magnetic fields," Keller said. "We didn't know that they detected it to use as an aid in navigation. "You have sharks that can travel 20,000 kilometers (12.427 miles) and end up in the same spot." The question of how sharks perform long-distance migrations has intrigued researchers for years. The sharks undertake their

journeys in the open ocean where they encounter few physical features such as corals that could serve as landmarks.

Researchers exposed 20 bonnetheads to magnetic conditions that simulated locations hundreds of kilometers (miles) away from where they were caught off Florida. Power consumption in the country grew by around 19 per cent in the first fortnight of May to 51.67 billion units (BU) May to 51.67 billion units (BU) over the same period last year, showing recovery in industrial and commercial demand of electricity, according to the power ministry data.

During the first fortnight of May this year (from May 1 to 14), peak power demand met or the highest supply in a day touched the highest level of 168.78 GW (on May 6, 2021) and recorded growth of over 15 per cent over 146.54 GW (peak met) recorded in the same period in 2020 (on May 13, 2020).

The power consumption in April grew nearly 40 per cent to 118.08 BU.

Petrol, diesel price hiked again; petrol price nears ₹99 in Mumbai

Petrol price on Sunday was increased by 24 paise per litre and diesel by 27 paise, pushing rates across the coun-try to record highs and that of petrol in Mumbai to near Rs 99 a litre.

The increase led to rates in

Delhi climbing to Rs 92.58 per litre and diesel to Rs 83.22, according to a price notifica-tion of state-owned fuel retail-

ers. Rates had already crossed Rates had already crossed Rs 100-mark in several cities in Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra and with the latest increase, price in Mumbai too was inching towards that level. A litre of petrol in Mumbai now comes for Rs 98.88 and diesel is priced at Rs 90.40 per litre.

Fuel prices differ from state to state depending on the inci-dence of local taxes such as

VAT and freight charges. Rajasthan levies the highest value-added tax (VAT) on petrol in the country, followed by Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra. This is the ninth increase in prices since May 4 when the state-owned oil firms ended an 18-hiatus in rate revision they

additional stress on droan medical infrastructure where both government and private hospitals are already running short of beds, oxygen and other life saving equipment. From a partial lockdown (Red Alert Self-discipline fortnight) already in place since April, the state government has now announced a "strict, complete lockdown" from May 10 for two weeks. Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot said at a press conference, "The decision to impose strict lockdown has been taken due to the rising COVID-19 cases in rural areas, increasing instances of youth

That scenario has completely changed this years demand for health services. That's why several volunteer groups are trying to help people through helplines and social media.

Public representatives, government officials and philanthropists are also donating funds to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund to help fight the crisis. Help is pouring in from MPLAD/MLA funds to facilitate purchase of oxygen cylin-

ders, concentrators, PPE kits, N-95 masks, sanitizers and other lifesaving equipment. While some organisations have come up with complimentary telemedicine services, some others have decided to provide oxygen concentrators/plants. "Given the shortage of oxygen, we have decided to donate at least 10 oxygen concentrators belp patients, who are in queue for a hospital bed with oxygen support," said Suresh Kalani of the laipur based Rajesh Kalani Foundation.

There are other good Samaritans who continue catering to the needs of COVID-19 patients in home isolation, by getting them food, groceries, medicines etc. On the con-
