5th fire case in State hospitals in current year; probe ordered

 $I^{\rm n}$ a fifth accident of its kind in a hospital in Maharashtra during the current year, as many as 11 Covid-19 patients died and six others sustained burn wounds after a massive fire broke out at the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) of a civil hospital in Ahmednagar district on

Seventeen Covid-19 patients were undergoing treatment at the ICU of the hospital, when the fire broke out there at 10.30 am. Of them, 10 died on the spot, while one more person succumbed to burn wounds later. Six others are undergoing treatment at some other ward of the hospital.

Expressing his condolences over the death of Covid-19 patients in the mishap, Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray announced a comprehensive enquiry into the circumstances leading to



"A high-level committee Divisional Commissioner will go into the cause of mishap. It will fix responsibility, if any, for the negligence on the part of the hospital staff. Stern action will be taken against the erring hospital staff," the Chief Minister said.

Shortly after the fire broke out, three fire tenders and several water tankers belonging to the Ahmednagar fire brigade rushed to the scene and brought the situation under control within 45 minutes.

According to one version, an electrical short-circuit might have caused fire. The other version said that an air-conditioner caught fire, prompting the hospital administration to switch off the oxygen supply to the ward. Some of the patients died due to suffocation, while others died because of fire

In a related development, the Chief Minister announced a compensation of ₹5 lakh to the family members of each of the patient killed in the mishap, while another ₹2 lakh would be given to the families of each of the patient from the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) fund.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed his anguish over the Ahmednagar hospital mishap. "Anguished by the loss of lives due to a fire in a hospital in Ahmednagar, Maharashtra. Condolences to the bereaved families. May the injured recover at the earliest,' Modi tweeted.



The district administration identified nine of those killed in the mishap as Sitaram Dagdu Jadhav (83), Bhivaji Sadashiv Pawar (80), Ramkisan Vitthal Harpude (70) Kondabai Madhukar Kadam (70), Chababi Ahmed Sayyad (65), Satyabhama Shivaji Ghodchaure (65), Kadubal Gangadhar Khatik (65) Asrabai Govind Nangare (58) and Deepak Vishwanath

Jagdale (37). The identities of two more patients - one of who died on the spot and another succumbed to burn wounds were not immediately known. The remaining six patients have been shifted to a Covid-19 ward in another hospital.

Among the age group of 18-44 years, total 42,33,49,812 shots of first dose and 14.89.38.412 of second dose have been administered so far, as per the Health Ministry

A total of 17,60,88,375 vaccines as the first dose and 9.85.40.180 vaccines as the sec-

ond dose have been administered to the age group of 45-59, till now, said the Health Ministry on Saturday morning. Around 15.69 crore bal-

ance and unutilised Covid vaccine doses are still available with the States and Union Territories (UTs) to be administered, as per the data shared by the Union Health Ministry.

Over 116.54 crore vaccine doses have been provided to the States and UTs through the Government of India free of cost channel and direct State procurement category, said the Ministry.

India, France to deepen ties on defence, security

NSA Doval holds talks in Paris with French Foreign, **Defence Ministers**

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

Tndia and France will further Astrengthen their strategic and defence ties with a focus on maritime security, including in the Indo-Pacific region. The two countries will also work together closely in the sphere of nuclear energy and space.

These were the major take aways from the meeting between National Security Adviser (NSA) Ajit Doval and French Foreign Minister Jean-Yves Le Drian and and Defence Minister Florence Parly in Paris on Friday, officials said here on Saturday. The two sides also reviewed the entire gamut of bilateral ties, they added.

The meeting took place on



the occasion of the 35th session of the Indo-French strategic dialogue. Following up on the meeting between President Emmanuel Macron and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on the sidelines of the G20 in Rome recently, Le Drian stressed his country's commitment to deepening the Indo-French strategic partnership and strengthening its various aspects, particularly in the areas of defence, space, civil nuclear energy and security.

Doval and Le Drian also discussed the priorities in the fight against climate change with his interlocutor.

Sidhu obstructing functioning of Govt, my office: Punjab AG

Tn what could be seen as between Puniab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi and State Congress president Navjot Singh Sidhu, Punjab Advocate General APS Deol on Saturday attacked the PCC president, accusing him of obstructing the functioning of the State Government and his office as well as "spreading misinformation to gain political advan-

Deol's remarks came a day after Sidhu withdrew his resignation as Punjab Congress chief but declared that he will not resume charge till Deol is removed as AG and a panel set up for the appointment of the new director general of police

Sidhu had resigned from the post on September 28.

In a statement, Deol said Sidhu's "repeated utterances seek to derail the earnest efforts of the State Government to ensure justice in the drugs



matter and the sacrilege cases". "Sidhu is obstructing the functioning of the Government and the office of the advocate general," he alleged, adding that he was spreading misin-

formation to gain political advantage over his political colleagues.
"There is a concerted attempt by vested interests to

malign the functioning of the Congress party in view of coming elections in Punjab for their selfish political gain by politicking the constitutional office of the Advocate General of Punjab," Deol added.

NIA team in Canada to get Khalistani outfits terror tag

Anational Investigation Agency (NIA) team probing the funding of local NGOs by foreign secessionist Khalistani outfits like Sikhs for Justice (SFJ) has liaised with the Canadian authorities in Ottawa to seek legal action, including their listing as terror entities The NIA team was in

Ottawa on Thursday and Friday at the invitation of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police or RCMP for better coordinating investigation against entities and individuals suspected of terrorism and to discuss other criminal matters.

The NIA had earlier this year formally requested Canada to declare SFJ a terrorist enti-



shared dossiers with the Canadian law enforcement authorities during interactions in Ottawa, sources said.

The NIA team's visit comes as the federal anti-terror agency has evidence to substantiate India's claim that SFI was fueling violence in India, particularly in Punjab, as part of its separatist agenda. The SFJ is also spearheading the Punjab Referendum at the behest of Pakistani agency Inter-Services

Headquartered in New York, the SFJ, aided by ISI, has spread its tentacles globally and has emerged as an influential voice among pro-Khalistan elements in Canada. The SFI was banned in India last year under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act.

Public Safety Canada's cur rently listed entities include two Khalistani outfits — Babbar Khalsa International and International Sikh Youth Federation — other than groups like the Taliban, Islamic State, Al Qaida and its affiliates Boko Haram, Haqqani Network, Hizbul Mujahideen, Indian Mujahideen, Jaish-e-Mohammad and Lashkar-e-Tayabba among several others. 'I like human interest stories'

ROHIT ROY, who plays Ajay, a lawyer in MX Player's Sanak- Ek Junoon, speaks with SUPRIYA RAMESH about his role, his experience whilst shooting and the challenges

■What is your role?

It's a very interesting layered role. It's about a small town boy with big dreams in his eyes and it's about what lengths he wants to go through to attain what he thinks is success. Also it shows the cut throat world of the legal world in Mumbai. Being a junior lawyer, he desperately wants to become a senior lawyer and what all he does, that's Ajay in a nutshell.

How did you come on board for this project?

Vikram Bhatt is somebody who I have worked with in the past. In 2018, we did a show called *Memories*. Obviously he must have enjoyed something that he saw because the show was very good and I think my performance wasn't bad either. So he called me back again last year for Sanak- Ek Junoon". I think there is some level of trust that he has in me as an actor, that whatever is given to me will be delivered to the best of my abilities. So I think that's the reason sanak happened.

■ Do you relate to the role in real

Not at all. It's as different like chalk and cheese. Forget about relating to the character, I would not even think of stuff that Ajay actually ends up doing in the show. That's because we have a very different mentality. That's why I say it's the most challenging role I have done in my career till now.

Challenging because there is no commonality and similar thought process between me and the character so I had to clearly build a brand new character. A lot of actors actually do that but when there is absolutely zero common ground between your real self and your character, you have to start everything from scratch and usually we don't have that kind of time, liberty and luxury. But with Sanak I had to do it because I realized that it would not have been believable.

■ How was it to act besides your co-



star Aindrita?

Aindrita is such a bundle of joy. I really love her. She is like a little kid. She is a big star down South but she's got the hunger of a newcomer and that's what I like. Because I had the

makes a difference when you are doing a show like Sanak where you are playing husband and wife. Our intimate scenes and husband-wife scenes were very comfortable to shoot because I know her and I'm fond of her and vice versa. It was really good to work with her.

■ An anecdote from the series which is very close to your heart.

There are several anecdotes from the stories but one thing that I'll never forget is the first shot that Aindritta and I did. On day 1, she kept fluffing up her lines and it went to a stage where we were wondering whether we could finish the show. That's one thing that I can narrate as it was day 1. Day 2, she was a completely different human being. I would fluff up some dialogues but she was going on like a rocket. I think that's one more thing that I realised working with her. Sometimes the beginnings can be slow but the end is at speed.

■ How did acting happen?

Acting happened to me in a way quite by accident I would say. It's not something that I had planned. I had come to Mumbai to do my MBA and I didn't get a visa. I had never desired to become an actor or model. But I had no plan B as my visa got rejected. I had nothing to do and at that point I kind of got an offer to become an actor. Quite frankly, the offer didn't come to me but came to Mansi to act in swabhiman. She wasn't interested in acting in television. I called the producer and asked him whether I can do this role and audition. So that's how swabhiman happened and I call myself an actor by accident.

■ How is working for a TV show different from a film?

TV shows are shot very fast and back to back. We don't have the liberty to spend time on characterisation, dialogues and look. Whatever is given to us we quickly enact it and get it on the way because it is going to telecast the next day and that's the pressure of television. But having

said that, that's also a very good training ground for an actor. Now when I do movies, you don't have to

tell me anything.

I'm already prepared, that pressure is a great help in your acting. We used to do seven pages of dialogue on 1 shot in television. We used to remember our dialogues and also the co-actors' lines. That helps you but in cinema you have the luxury of building a character, role and creating a brand new character from scratch. Working on the nuances, clothing, just the way the character stands, talks, walks and all of that. I think that's the essential difference. Film is a little larger than life wheras in television it Should be a little more natural.

■What kind of stories attract

I like human interest stories. For me that's what I really like and Sanak is a part of a genre that I like. It's a thriller but it is still a human interest story. Its about a couple and their relationship. Other than that I like romance and watch romance. I hate doing romance because I'm bad at it. I find it very odd but I love watching romance and comedy.

■What have the challenges been like till now?

I don't know what challenges I faced on a particular project but every project has it's different set of challenges. Like coming back to creating a role, not knowing what the outcome is going to be so you are taking a risk about what you think is right. You know the way I played Ajay is not necessarily the way people might perceive, see or like it. That's a risk you are taking. All that stays in your mind when you are shooting for a project. But half way through the project, you go into auto

Then recent times have been tough and challenging because of COVID. But otherwise it's all a great journey. I don't see it as the challenges I faced but I see it as part of the process.

The city will witness a partly cloudy sky with shallow to moderate fog in the morning and strong surface winds during the day, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Saturday.

The maximum temperature is likely to hover around 28 degrees Celsius, it said. Humidity at 8.30 am was 78 per cent, the IMD said. Weather scientists said

Rai on Friday blamed the BJP for defying of the firecracker ban by people, alleging that the saffron party made them burst crackers on purpose, as the city's air quality index (AOI) entered the 'severe' category on Diwali night and continued its upward trend to

The 24-hour average air AQI the day after Diwali was 435 last year, 368 in 2019; 390 in 2018; 403 in 2017 and 445 in 2016. The AQI was 382 on Diwali day this year, 414 in 2020; 337 in 2019; 281 in 2018; 319 in 2017 and 431 in 2016.

The Delhi Cabinet on Friday approved a budget of ₹1,544 crore under the Emergency Covid-19 Response Package to bolster health systems in order to be prepared for a possible third wave, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said.

"The cabinet was of the consensus that Corona is not over yet and a third wave can be expected. Thus...There should not be any hesitations with respect to the control and prevention of the spread of Covid-19. In this direction, the Delhi Cabinet unanimously approved a budget of ₹1,544.24 crore for the State ECRP 2021-22 to further strengthen the fight against Corona," Kejriwal said.

The Chief Minister said that in view of a possible wave of Covid-19, the Delhi Government is trying its best to strengthen its health systems

and preparedness at every level.

"As a responsible
Government, we are taking all
measures and steps necessary in this fight against Covid. In view of the advent of a possible wave of Covid, the Delhi government is trying its best to strengthen its health systems and preparedness at every he said.

According to officials, the budget will be spent on further

enhancing testing and labs procuring supplies, mobilising additional human resources, increasing health facilities in hospitals and managing Covid Care Centres, among others.

"Of the total budget, ₹415 crore will be used for the strengthening of Covid-19 testing and labs. ₹445 crore will be allotted for procurement of supplies. A budget of ₹280 crore will help bolster health facilities and hospitals along with an amount of ₹125 crore that will aid the management of Covid care centres," the Government said in a state-

"The experts are anticipating a third wave of Covid-19 cases in India, including Delhi, bigger than the earlier surges of Covid-19 cases. The Delhi government in that view had constituted a state level task force under state nodal officer and several task-based sub committees to prepare for management of pro in Delhi," it added.

Officials said that 6,836 ICU beds will be added in seven hospitals in Delhi after which the capacity of ICU beds in the national capital will increase to 17,000.

Parking collapse: City Govt orders probe

The Delhi Government has ordered an enquiry into the automated multilevel parking incident, asking the director of the civic body to submit its report within 15 days.

The parking lot which collapsed was inaugurated by the South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC) in

November last year.

Deputy Chief Minister

Manish Sisodia said that the Delhi Government will not tolerate wastage of taxpayers' money and negligence in public safety. "The Government has taken cognizance of this matter and ordered the director of local bodies to investigate the matter through the 'Public Works Department' of the Delhi Government.

"The director has to submit

a report within 15 days to recognise the lapses in parking construction so that appropriate action can be issued. The MCD collected huge money from the nearby shopkeepers in the name of parking conversion charges. Traders' shops were sealed and a parking space was constructed. But within a year, the parking space was engulfed in corruption by the BIP-ruled MCD and had started to collapse. Due to which many cars have been damaged," he said Sisodia said that the BJP

ruled MCD in Delhi always weeps for lack of money, but even when they have the money, they indulge in corruption and are dishonest with public money. "The multi-level parking of Green Park has fallen prey to the BJP-ruled MCD's corruption.

This parking lot was inaugurated by the BJP leaders with great enthusiasm in November last year but within a year it broke down. Electric floor plates have started to fall apart inside the parking lot, which has damaged many cars and many people have suffered heavy losses. "The main line of defence is now vaccination. We have secured sufficient supplies to support vaccination and efforts should be made to maximise uptake," the L-G said, setting a timeline of one week for 100 per cent coverage of the overdue second doses. Instructions were also issued to the officials concerned to ensure that restrictions on the public gatherings continue, besides declaration of red zones and micro containment zones in areas registering surge in positive cases on priority, an official spokesper-

Srinagar int'l airport declared 'major airport'

Cooperative societies too not secure, get in crosshairs of cyber criminals

As digitisation has become the buzzword amid the tive societies, particularly banks whether big or small — are finding themselves in the crosshairs of cyber criminals. This has prompted stakeholders like the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) to step forward to ensure cyber security of digital assets of these institutions.

"There has been growing awareness of an organisation's cyber preparedness and defence mechanisms. A large number of institutions wake up to this reality only after an incident. Considering the seriousness of issues connected with cyber-security and protecting the interests of members of various cooperative societies including banks, we have constituted

Cooperative Institutions Cybersecurity Advisory Forum (ĆICAF) way back in May

several rounds of training programs on cyber-security for cooperative institutions, including banks since then. Also, a draft model framework for "Cyber-security and IT Guidelines for User Interaction" has also been formulated under the supervision of former Cyber Security Advisor in PMO Dr Gulshan Rai, who is now Senior Advisor (cyber security) with our organisation," NCDC MD Sundeep K Nayak said.

However, he refused to share details of the draft stating that it was still being discussed. The NCDC will be holding a meeting on November 8 with all the interested stakeholders to discuss the draft as well as ways to further tighten the system and

plug the loopholes in cyber

In fact, the need for the guidelines for cyber security of sistently felt for the past few years particularly after reports of hackers attack in various cooperatives dealing in finance business. For instance, in late 2018, Cosmos Bank, India's second largest co-operative bank, was attacked by hackers who siphoned off over Rs. 94 crore through a malware attack

on one of its servers. Similarly, later in May 2019, a cooperative bank known as Urban Cooperative got hacked and in the process lost ₹68 lakh from one of its biggest accounts. In December 2019, data leak from insiders led to the loss of ₹29 crores from Shamrao Vitthal Cooperative Bank while the Chembur Nagarik Sahakari bank which has only 10 branches and serves customers

located in the Chembur suburb of Mumbai has reported hackers trying to attack its servers. This seems to be just the tip

of the iceberg as a lot of incidents go unreported either because the banks don't realise a data breach in the first place or fear reputation loss, pointed out players in the sector.

Jyotindra Mehta, President, National Federation of Urban Cooperative Banks and Credit Societies Ltd. (NAFSCUB), pointed out that as most of the banks are very small the price involved in following RBI guidelines to adopt the cyber security technology is very huge. "These banks need to be provided with a technology umbrella to cover their risk. We have to come together to face the cyber security challenge in terms of advisory and functionally as well," he said.

Dr Gulshan Rai talked about the gravity of the problem in today's fully networked and machine learning which, he said, makes it easy to manipulate the software. "Software manipulation poses risk to the digital assets and may have huge financial and strategic impact. Moreover, convergence of technology and high speed of communication coming up with 4G & 5G will make it even more difficult to have security of digital assets and informa-

tion contained in digital assets. As per the RBI data, in at least ten years till 2018, banks in India faced 130,000 reported cases of cyber fraud involving an estimated ₹700 crore. In comparison to the asset value held by the banks, this is a small amount, however, a severe cyber-attack can result in bank failure even when no money is lost directly, said the experts.

'Dapagliflozin can be used for treatment of chronic kidney disease: Lancet

Dapagliflozin — a common diabetes drug can be used as an option for treating peo-ple with chronic kidney disease (CKD) in adults, claims a study published in the journal Lancet. Dapagliflozin belongs to a group of medicines called 'sodium glucose cotransporter-2

(SGLT2) inhibitors'.

An SGLT2 inhibitor works by blocking the SGLT2 protein in the kidneys. Blocking this protein alleviates kidney damage by reducing pressure and inflammation in the kidneys. It also helps to stop protein from reduces blood pressure and body weight.

A clinical trial of 4,304 participants with CKD revealed that dapagliflozin reduces the rate of kidney function decline in patients with chronic kidney disease (CKD).

The participants were divided into two groups: With dapagliflozin 10 mg or placebo once daily, added to standard care.

Although participants without diabetes also experienced a slower rate of kidney function decline with dapagliflozin, the effect of dapagliflozin was greater in those with diabetes.

"The key conclusion is that

dapagliflozin is an effective treatment to slow progressive kidney function loss in patients

The participants were divided into two groups: With dapagliflozin 10 mg or placebo once daily, added to standard care

with CKD with and without type 2 diabetes," said lead author Hiddo Lambers Heerspink, from the University Medical Center Groningen.

'Therefore, in addition to reducing the risk of heart failure or mortality, dapagliflozin kidney function decline, Heerspink added.

CKD is a long-term condition in which the kidneys do not work as they should. It is common, especially in older people. In the early stages, there are usually few symptoms and people can have the condition without knowing it.

CKD is often caused by other conditions that affect the kidneys. These include diabetes, high blood pressure, high cholesterol and kidney infections. Making healthy lifestyle choices and controlling underlying conditions are important. CKD can get worse over time, but treatments can stop or delay this, and many people live for a long time with their condition well controlled.

Population control: Fresh plea in SC seeks to make States, UTs as parties

A fresh plea has been filed in the Supreme Court seeking to make States and Union Territories as parties in a PIL that has sought certain steps, including two-child norm, to control the country's growing population.



Veerraju said the BJP would step up the agitation with people's support if the State Government did not reduce VAT on petrol and diesel forthwith. BJP cadres organised protests at all district Collectorates on the petro price issue. Court sends Maha former HM Anil Deshmukh to 14 days jail

REFUSES TO ENTERTAIN ED'S PLEA FOR EXTENSION OF HIS CUSTODY BY 9 DAYS

TN RAGHUNATHA MUMBAI

Having declined to entertain a plea by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) seeking extension of his custody by nine days, a Special Holiday Court on Saturday remanded Maharashtra's former Home Minister and accused in a money laundering case Anil Deshmukh in judicial custody

On a day when his son Hrishikesh Deshmukh-- who is also being investigated -- approached the Sessions Court seeking anticipatory bail, Sr Deshmukh was produced before Holiday Special Court Judge P. R. Sitre. The Special Judge rejected the ED's plea to extend Sr Deshmukh's custody for nine more days. Instead, he sent the former State Home Minister to judicial custody for 14 days.

Seven-one-year-old Deshmukh was arrested in the early hours of November after intense grilling lasting for more than 12 hours in the alleged money laundering case linked to the charges of extortion made against him by Mumbai's former Bir Singh.

Deshmukh - who had skipped the summons issued by the ED on five occasions -- had said ahead of his arrest: "A 24 section 7 of the amended

false narrative and erroneous impression is being created by the vested interests that I am evading or avoiding to appear before the Enforcement Directorate. Undoubtedly, such propaganda is baseless. All that ever wanted is a transparent, fair and objective probe without any fear or favour so that the truth is not rendered causality". Deshmukh had resigned

from his post as the State Home Minister on April 5 2021 within hours after the Bombay High Court ordered a "Preliminary Enquiry" (PE) by the CBI into the serious charges of corruption made against him by Mumbai's former Police Commissioner Param Bir Singh. He is being investigated by the CBI and Enforcement Directorate (ED) over the allegations of corruption made by Param Bir Singh.

It may be recalled that on March 20, the former commissioner of police had alleged that State Home Minister Deshmukh had asked now arrested and dismissed police officer Sachin Vaze to "collect" a staggering Rs 100 crore per month from bars, restaurants

Deshmukh is being investigated by the CBI in connection with a First Information Report (FIR) registered by it on April

Prevention of Corruption Act and section 120-b (conspiracy) of IPC for an "attempt to obtain undue advantage for important and dishonest performance of the public duty".

Having prima facie found "cognisance offences" of corruption and conspiracy against him during a Preliminary Enquiry (PE) conducted by it into the allegations made against him by Mumbai's former Police Commissioner Param Bir Singh, the CBI on April 21 registered a regular case against him and

other unknown people.

Having established a trail for Rs 4.7 crore allegedly paid by the 10 bar owners in Mumbai over a period of three months December 2020 and February 2021, the ED had conducted raids on the three residences and one property of Deshmukh on June 25.

The ED has alleged that of the total amount, Rs 4.18 crore was then deposited in cash with four Delhi-based shell companies- Reliable Finance Corporation Pvt. Ltd, VA Realcon Pvt. Ltd., Utsav Securities Pvt. Ltd. and Sital Leasing and finance Pvt. ltd. donated the entire money to Shri Sai Shikshan Sansthan Trust, a charitable trust headed by Anil Deshmukh and his

Suresh was taken into custody by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) along with another accused Sandeep Nair from Bengaluru on July 11, 2020, also a Today, Suresh refused to talk to the media initially,

but said she will respond later following which the television channels followed her to her residence in the city. However, her mother told the waiting media there her daughter was not feeling well as she just got released from the jail, and will not be talking to them today.

Earlier, after completing the official bail proceedings, Suresh left the "Vanitha" jail at Attakulangara here, where she had been lodged.

The court had granted bail to Suresh, a former employee of the UAE consulate here, subject to furnishing a bond of ₹25 lakh with two solvent sureties each for the like amount.

Fuel tanker blast in Sierra Leone, kills 92

n oil tanker exploded near An oil tanker exploded near Sierra Leone's capital, killing at least 92 people and severely injuring dozen of others after large crowds gathered to collect leaking fuel, officials and witnesses said on Saturday.

The explosion took place late on Friday after a bus struck the tanker in Wellington, a suburb just to the east of Freetown.

The mortuary at Connaught Hospital reported 92 bodies had been brought in by Saturday morning. About 30 severely burned victims were not expected to survive, according to Foday Musa, a staff member in the intensive care unit.

Injured people whose clothes had burned off in the fire that followed the explosion lay naked on stretchers as nurses attended to them on Saturday. Hundreds of people milled outside the main gates of the mortuary and near the hospital's main entrance, waiting for word of their loved ones.

It was not immediately known how many people were undergoing treatment for burns because patients were taken to hospitals and clinics across the metropolitan area.

8 dead in stampede at US music festival

At least eight people have died and scores of others injured in what authorities déscribed as a "mass casualty" incident on the opening night of a popular music festival here in Texas attended by some 50,000 fans of American rapper Travis Scott.

The sold-out concert by Scott at the Astroworld Festival in Houston had to be cancelled immediately after people started falling after the massive crowd began "to compress toward the front of the stage" around 9:00-9:15 pm (local time) on Friday, CNN reported.

Multiple fans were trampled as hundreds rushed the event's perimeter. Once inside, some people began climbing onto portable toilets as security personnel worked to try and contain the crowd, ABC 13 news website reported.

We had scores of individuals that were injured," Houston Fire Chief Sam Pena said during a news conference early on Saturday morning.

The crowd began to compress toward the front of the stage, and people began to panic," Pena said.

Describing what unfolded as a "mass casualty" incident, the fire chief said that 17 patients were rushed to local hospitals. More than 300 people were treated at the field hospital set up near the festival,

Pena said, adding that the concert drew about 50,000 attendees. So far, eight people have died and hundreds of others injured during the opening night of the popular weekend music festival, authorities said. Astroworld organisers did

not immediately respond to CNN's request for comment early Saturday morning.

Organised by rapper Scott, the third annual festival featuring multiple acts was scheduled to run from Friday through Saturday, according to the event's website. The view from SkyEye overhead Friday night showed the heavy police and fire department activity in the area of the event as organisers ended it early.

The organisers, rapper Scott and LiveNation, stopped

Sudan activists reject power-sharing with army, call strikes

Sudan's protest movement has rejected internationally backed initiatives to return to a power-sharing arrangement with the military after last month's coup, announcing two days of nationwide strikes starting on Sunday. The movement called for the establishment of a civilian Government to lead a transition to democracy.

The call came as a leader of the country's main political party accused the military leadership of negotiating in bad faith. The Sudanese military seized power Oct. 25, dissolving the transitional administration and arresting dozens of

government officials and politicians. The coup has been met with international outcry and massive protests in the streets of Khartoum and elsewhere in the country.

The takeover has upended the country's fragile planned transition to democratic rule, more than two years after a popular uprising forced the removal of longtime autocrat Omar al-Bashir and his Islamist Government.

Since the coup, the international community has accelerated mediation efforts to find a way out of the crisis, which threatens to further destabilize the already restive Horn of Africa region.

In determining that the crimes against civilians appear to be widespread and systematic, he said investigators saw patterns of violence — a measured response by security forces to demonstrations in the first six weeks or so after the military takeover followed by "an uptick in violence and much more violent methods used to suppress the demon-

The real GDP is the inflation adjusted figure of all the finished goods and services produced in a country within

a specific time period. In a report, MOFSL said its in-house estimates suggest India's real GDP grew at 8-9 per cent YoY in Q2FY22, marginally higher than "our expecta-

The second quarter GDP numbers have not yet been released. The macro-economic data points are slated to be released on November 30.

MOFSL said: "Looking at our EAI estimates, we believe that better growth was largely supported by massive government spending in 2QFY22."

Besides, the report said the economic activity for October 2021 appeared promising.

"Most of the indicators PMI manufacturing, toll collections, e-way or vahaan registrations, mobility indicators, and power generation improved last month."

However, the brokerage house's preliminary estimates indicate that Economic Activity Index (EAI) for India's GVÁ posted a seven-month low growth of 5.4 per cent YoY in September 2021 versus 11.7 per cent YoY in August 2021.

"Consequently, EAI-EVA grew 9.2 per cent YoY in 2QFY22 on account of lower growth in the aFarm and Non-Farm' sectors.

hour-long 'Mahurat Trade Session', FIIs sold Rs 328.11 crore worth of stocks on the BSE, NSE and MSEI in the capital market segment.

In terms of corporate earnings, Siddhartha Khemka, - Retail Research, Broking & Distribution, Motilal Oswal Financial Services said: "Companies have largely delivered in line with expectation. Most companies have indicated of recovery in demand as the economy opened up although higher commodity and energy prices have exerted downward pressure on margins."

"Companies have taken price hikes to pass on the impact of commodity costs, and the impact of it on demand remains to be seen. However, valuations are still at a premium and would demand consistent earning delivery going ahead. Thus market might continue to remain under pressure till valuations get reasonable and global cues improve."

According to Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services: "On a near to medium basis, investors should focus on defensive sectors in anticipation of higher market volatility."

'Biofuel is the future'

SHRIKUMAR SURYANARAYAN (RESEARCHER & INNOVATOR)

e has a list of accomplishments and not a name to be trifled with when it comes to development of technology for offshore biomass production and conversion to a variety of bio-products including agricultural bio-stimulants, renewable fuels and chemicals. The words are Suryanarayanthe MD-co-founder of Sea6 Energy, Bangalore.

The company was founded in 2010 in Chennai by several alumni of IIT-Madras. Shrikumar, formerly the President of Research and Development and Chief Scientific Advisor at Biocon Limited, Bangalore the largest life-science company in India for over 25 years has served as the CEO for the Translational Health Sciences Institute at the Delhi-NCR Biosciences Cluster.

He has BTech in Chemical Engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras and a Masters in Biotechnology from the Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi. Shrikumar was conferred the Distinguished Alumnus Award of the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras in 2009 and was chosen as Entrepreneur of the Year by Bio Spectrum in 2012. If this was not enough to add to his credentials, he is also the present President of the Association of Biotechnology Led Enterprises of India.

Explaining what his company does, Shrikumar tells you that at present his company is involved in production of all things that are biological.

"Let's take an example of biological matter — plant matter. Biological matter can be derived from plants or animals. From this we can get protein and take it further and get energy from it. In other words, you can get energy from plant matter. If we take a step back, we can make all kinds of bio-products - from simple to complex bio-products. One such product is ethanol — a biofuel. Once you make this, one can make several petro-chemical products from this. There are several technologies that can do this," Shrikumar tells you.

What this translates into is that if you have an unlimited source of plant matter, you

can make a whole variety of products. However, there is a catch here.

"You need to have a large unlimited supply of plant matter. So why should we go out in the sea and make plant matter? The answer is simple. Let's make a calculation. India imported a little over 198 million tonnes of crude in 2020-21. When this is burnt carbon dioxide is released leading to global warming. A good solution is to switch to bio-fuels. But to make this shift we will need four times the plant matter — for every kg of crude oil, we will need 4 kg of biomass," Shrikumar says.

The country will need one billion tonnes of plant matter to make the substitute from crude oil to biofuel. One can use agricultural waste. But the entire output of agriculture in India stands at less than one billion tonnes a year.

"One can only imagine the waste we will get. Obviously not enough. If the entire land is used to make biofuel, what will we eat? So instead of picking up the sunlight that falls on the land why not pick it from the sea? There are many plants that grow. Nature is versatile. Seaweed is one of them and can be converted into biofuels. But we need a billion tonnes of it. Just like we cultivate the land for agriculture, we have to cultivate the sea," Shrikumar explains. And says biofuels are the future.

Does India have enough sea space to cultivate a billion tonnes of plant matter and infringe on international waters? The answer is a yes. "To satisfy India's demand for crude oil, we need one lakh sa km of cultivation. We only need sea space the size that is less than the area Tamil Nadu or Puniab. India is lucky since we get so much sunlight all the year around. We can definitely produce enough bio-fuel. Our company does precisely this."

"We have the technology to cultivate on sea. At present, we have a small portion of the sea in India and Indonesia. While we are waiting for our farm to grow and making more sea farms, we are making using seaweed that can be used in agriculture. The produce grows faster and gives more yield from the same acre. Farmers can feed more people and there is no soil pollution. Also, since there is more yield, they need more carbon dioxide. For every ₹1 spent on buying our product, the farmer gets a benefit of anywhere between ₹5 to ₹25," Shrikumar says.

It is time to go green

VIDYUT MOHAN (INNOVATOR)

hat if it was possible to convert waste crop residue into valueadded chemicals like activated carbon on-site? Vidyut Mohan, co-founder of Takachar has created technology that turns waste crop residue which can mitigate smoke emissions. At income for marginalised farmers. His company is a social enterprise enabling farmers to prevent open burning of their waste farm residues.

Passionate about energy access and supporting rural livelihood, Vidyut became interested in biomass-based energy/chemical development due to its untapped potential and close association with farmers.

After completing his master's thesis at TU Delft, he came back to India to work with village communities in the Himalayas. This work led him to discover a way to scale farm residue utilisation through technology, as well as to support farm-based livelihood which in turn led to the formation of Takachar.

He tells you that the mission of his company is to drastically scale the utilisation of agricultural and forest waste to reduce air pollution, create livelihood and mitigate and prevent carbon emissions.

"We have developed small low-cost equipment that can be used in a decentralised way to process this waste into useful products and fertilisers. Our team has developed these equipment that were lab designed by my co-founder and myself," Vidyut says.

He did his masters in sustainable energy technology and specialise in biomass technol-



School for Social Entrepreneurs India. Vidyut is also a 2019 Echoing Green Fellow. His interest to convert agricultural and forest waste came when he did a pilot project in the Himalayas - to convert

pine needle waste into a mar-

ketable charcoal-based product.

"The success from this proiect is what motivated me to venture into this field and continue to do so. The people in the region managed to earn a livelihood — managed to double their income — from the waste and also prevented forest fires during the pilot. The pine needles were used to make charcoal using our equipment," Vidyut

The idea to convert pine needles came while he was ursuing his masters.

"I was deeply interested in biomass because I thought it had a lot of potential. It was an interesting research question for me to explore. India is a great space for exploring this as there is a lot of biomass generated when it comes to agriculture

and forest waste. I focused on technical development but I didn't want to limit my thesis to this alone. We worked with an organisation in Uttrakhand who hosted us. They were using pine needles to generate electricity in the region. That's how we ended up making char-

coal," Vidyut recounts. The reason to come back to India and work here was easy enough for him. Though he had a one-year visa and he could always go back to Europe, he just found a field that had him hook, line and sinker.

"I just found a field where I loved working in. The whole idea of also exploring my venture and working on the pilot was exciting. I feel that what I studied is something that can be applied in developing countries. The challenges are so much more here. We need to grow and economically bring people out of poverty and at the same time, fight climate change," Vidyut tells you.

This year, his company was among five winners of the first-ever Earthshot Prizes instituted by Prince William to reward innovators with £1 million each for developing groundbreaking solutions to the world's greatest environmental challenges.

"Basically, we take any type of agricultural waste and put it into a machine. It undergoes a roasting process. It heats the waste between 200-350°C in a controlled amount of air. This, after a certain process, can be used to make fuels, fertilisers and even speciality chemicals like activated carbon. For example rice waste can be used to make fertiliser," Vidyut says.

Hamilton even trailed Mercedes teammate Valtteri Bottas, who was more than 0.4 seconds behind Verstappen in the high altitude and thin air of Mexico City's Autodromo Hermanos Rodriguez.

Verstappen's teammate Sergio Perez was on Hamilton's rear wheel in fourth after recovering from a crash in Friday's first practice.

Verstappen leads Hamilton by 12 points heading into the final five races. The 24-year-old Dutchman is trying to two years. The tricky conditions made



win his first title. Hamilton, 36, is chasing a record-breaking eighth.

Red Bull found the speed to make a resounding recovery after Bottas and Hamilton were quickest in first practice, a session marked by clouds of dust on a track that hasn't been used in traction difficult and sent several car

That included Perez, the national favorite, who put his car into the wall just a few laps into the opening session. Red Bull had to park his car for 25 min-

utes of the hour-long session for repairs. Red Bull is heavily favored at the track. Verstappen won in Mexico City in 2017 and 2018. He was dominant through practice and qualifying again in 2019, but a starting grid penalty and a second lap tire puncture ruined his race and Hamilton won.

"The margins are going to be very close in qualifying to the Mercedes but hopefully we can lock out that front row," Perez said. "I don't think it has been a representative day in terms of predicting qualifying, tomorrow everything will be even closer.

Hamilton has conceded it will be very difficult for Mercedes to match Red Bull's race speed on Sunday. Unlike the previous race at the U.S. Grand Prix when Verstappen flipped Hamilton the middle finger and called him a "stupid idiot" after their cars nearly touched in practice, the drivers steered clear of each other in Mexico City. Red Bull Team Principal Christian Horner refused to rule out a potential team owner for Perez to forfeit a win to Verstappen.





It is not sufficient that you have a good product, market & finance. Brand creation helps. And this requires strategy and execution, write RAJIV GUPTE & ANAND LIMAYE, as they share examples of marketing strategies used by various brands

ndian advertising has come of age.

During pandemic, we saw a host of creative ideas, new business models and communication, which gave new dimension to Indian Brands. Some advertise ments attracted controversy as well. Advertisements by Sabyasachi, where they showed Indian Mangalsutra on a scantily dressed woman; FabIndia showing Indian traditional festival celebration with disregard to religion sentiments; and Dabur India, depicting same sex couple celebration Karva Chauth, have not been received well by the Indian audience in India and globally. All these advertisements have been withdrawn from all media. The ads were well noticed, discussed and the brands were well talked about. But does this have a positive impact on the brand or does it tarnish the brand image?

Concept of brand is central to Marketing. Brands bring sales, brands power companies, brands pay salaries. Consumers buy brands because, they are more than trademarks, they are trust marks. Brands are collective perception of consumer's about an entity. Brands there for exist in consumers mind, where products exists ate the shelf of a retailer.

Strawberry with cream may be your favourite dessert. But when you go fishing, you do not put strawberries there. You put a worm. Something similar happens in marketing. Consumer preference is the most important deciding factor. Consumers often do not buy the highest quality products. They buy the best value proposition depending upon their need and perception.

In the 1990s, Parle products, the confectionery and biscuits major in India, had a brand called, Rol-a-Cola candy. This was launched at the time when cola drinks were hooting up the market. Rol-a-Cola had an attractive price point of ₹2. Over a period of time, the brand was dropped in 2006 for the purpose of product portfolio rationalisation. Although consumers loved it so much that they would mix it with soda and water and make their own cola drink at a low cost. In 2019, a Twitter user communicated his desire to have the product and requested a comeback. The rolls segment is about 7,000 tonnes, and Parle has a 50 per cent share with high-power brands like Mazelo Poppins. The brand was relaunched for Gen Z at an attractive price point which would contribute to ₹100 crore revenue for Parle products. The brand today is far more vibrant and caters to the wants of consumers.


Yet another way is to never have a product proposition very similar to another product. You will have to spend a lot to establish in such a market. If there are two products similar to each other, a lot of promotional money is wasted. If one detergent brand says, 'first use it and then have trust, while another says 'buy with complete trust', both will be unnecessarily using a lot of promotional resources. Have a distinct product proposition, create a distinct identity for your product and serve a unique need of a consumer, at least in a unique manner. Our earlier observation on perceptual maps supports this suggestion. In a crowded market as well, if the products are differentiated, each has a place to exist and grow.

Good brands promise certain quality. The quality could be tangible like comfort, fitting, elegance in case of men shirts, or intangible like prestige, luxury, style. This collective perception about brand is called positioning.

BRAND POSITIONING

By repeated hammering of the message marketers create brand position. Brand position of Lux is beauty soap, Liril is freshness soap, and Lifebuoy is sportsman's soap. The position is created and reinforced by consistent communication like endorsement of film actors (Lux), waterfall and lemon slice (Liril), sports activities (Lifebuoy). Once a position is achieved, it is difficult for the competitors to dislodge it, as long as it is not weakened by the marketer's in consistent communication or over spent by competitors. Lux is essentially a ladies soap. When Shahrukh Khan endorsed the brand, Santoor gained easy entry. Line extensions of Liril and millennial advertising showing family togetherness was inconsistent with earlier position. Cinthol gained an entry for the freshness position. Lifebuoy repositioned the brand as Germi Check and went head on with Dettol. A classic overexerting from positioning point of view.

Titan launched Raga and Fastrack. A good brand portfolio segments the market and targets the consumers and then communicates with them effectively. Historically, no global watch brand has created a product specifically for women. Indian women are

different from Westerns and, therefore, a distinct consumer group. For Indian women, jewellery is an intimate treasure and possession. Also, the need to be considered sensuous is very high but in an Indian way. Thus, the brand Raga watches looks like jewellery and make a beauty statement. Average ownership of watches by women after Raga was

launched jumped to 65 per cent.
Similarly, for Fastrack, the insights were that urban youth were rapidly discovering the excitement of an uncommitted attitude and lifestyle. Also, for Indian college-going youth, style and affordability were key and, thus, came Fastrack. The price was stated upfront and sent a clear signal to the youth of its affordability. The students were told that the brand looked for inspiration on whatever was interesting to youth-denims, hip hop, beachwear, skating, tattoos, etc. Later, the brand was extended to affordable sunglasses and bags.

It is better to create a distinct identity. The positioning of SPINZ fragrance is distinct from that of FOGG, that of India today, Republic TV, WION, and Times Now are all distinct and different. But, creating such identity requires consistent communication. In today's world of over communication, chances are, once message would get missed in a clutter. So what is the most effective way of cutting through clutter and taking a position in consumers mind?

- Celebrity endorsements: Yes, It does help. It helps in cutting through the clutter of other messages, gives a distinct image to the brand, and adds prestige. It also has a rub-off effect of the celebrity image on the brand. But not always.
- Celebrity clutter: Sometimes, marketers use over exposed celebrities. If the celebrity endorses too many brands, your brand gets lost. How many people remember, which milk additive brand does Sachin Tendulkar endorse? Or, which apparel brand does Amitabh Bachchan endorse?
- Positioning fit: Many times Brands are endorsed by celebrity, whose image is not consistent with the message, to be delivered. A few years ago film star Jitendra endorsed a brand called 30+. It was a serious health tonic, which was inconsistent with Jitendra's Jumping Jack

image. It was an elegantly executed advertisement, but the brand failed.

- Execution fit: Just a good celebrity and a product, is not good enough to create a brand. The execution has to be good. Cricketer Hanse Kronje endorsed a suiting brand in a badly executed advertisement or Rajesh Khanna for a ceiling fan company. The brand is not even
- Credibility fit: Endorser's' image gets rubbed up on the brand, mostly positively, but how many of us believe that Amitabh Bachchan uses *Anar dana* or *Navratna Tel*?. Such ads do not meet aspirations of consumers.
- Celebrity under clout: At times if the endorsing celebrity gets bad publicity due to some reason, the brand suffers. Marketers have to be careful about it, otherwise along with positive image the negative of the endorser's also rub off. When Tiger Woods gained bad publicity due to his promiscuous behaviour, he lost most of his brands. But, I am amazed that today so many ads have come featuring celebrities who have bad publicity, like Shahrukh Khan for BJYUS or Shilpa Shetty for good morning brand. Yes, it will give top of the mind awareness. But, brand image? It will help celebrities, but brands?
- Owners Endorsement: Air India was a lagging brand. But with Tata take over, it has gained a new image. Tata's means trust. Air India has suddenly become a trusted brand. The position has changed from a lagging brand to one which can be trusted. Apart from other things, will surely have a positive impact on the image, as well as business. The cash register will start ringing which is visible in the stock market already.

Thus it is important that it is not sufficient that you have a good product, market and finance. Brand creation helps. This requires strategy and execution. Marketing strategies have much in common with war strategies. After all brands create loyalty, brands give price premiums and brands ensure sustainance.

ken or written by inspired leaders, they create revolutions that can topple empires. Ordinary words, on the other hand, don't carry such power. They are forgotten and rejected after a short period of time. For example, words printed on a newspaper become trash after a few hours; magazines become irrelevant after a week or a month; annual publications need to update themselves with latest information and bring out newer issues every year. Books advocating a certain ideology and lifestyle may stand the test of time for a few years or decades. But all such works have a limited shell life. limited shell life.

Scripture, which contains words spoken by God himself, doesn't become stale or outdated even after several ages. They continue to remain irrespective of culture, geography and religion. They are timeless which means the wisdom contained

ords carry great in these words will remain relevant power. When spo- eternally.

Bhagavad Gita is literally the "song of God." Throughout the Vedic literatures, Krishna is described as God, the original source of everything in the universe. Krishna himself declares his supreme position, "O conqueror of wealth, there is no truth superior to Me. Everything rests upon Me, as pearls are strung on a thread." And to convince the faithless who cannot appreciate Krishna's position as God, Krishna displays the vishva-rupa, the Universal Form, so that in the future people will not retain doubts about Krishna's identity.

About speech, Krishna makes an interesting statement in Gita (17.15). He says a good speech is characterised by four qualities:

• Anudvega-karam (non-agitating): Unless we are in a position of authority like a parent or teacher, we should not admonish anyone or try to correct the other person, and our words will not have the desired effect of transforming the person. In contrast, the

person is likely to develop deep hatred and anger against us and even take revenge at an opportune time.

• Satyam (truthful): Truth is relative - what is true today need not be true tomorrow. It is therefore recommended that we speak about the Absolute Truth as described in the Vedic literatures. • Priya (pleasing): In the name of

speaking truth, we don't want to hurt

people and break their hearts. We should speak palatable truth. If at all we have to speak unpalatable truths, we may use either humour or stories in order to convey the hard messages. As writer Mary Hirsch says, "Humour is a rubber sword — it allows you to make a point without drawing blood."

• *Hitam* (beneficial): Ultimately, our speech should uplift the life of the audience by enlightening them with transcendental wisdom. Otherwise, our speech will simply add cacophonic vibrations into the atmosphere

Krishna also recommends a powerful method by which we can control useless speech — by regularly reciting Vedic literature. Vedic sound is called apaurusheya, "not originating from a mundane source." Therefore, when we recite these shlokas and messages, which are mostly composed in Sanskrit, we are actually purifying the atmosphere that is filled with so much useless sound. Even if we don't understand their meanings, merely vibrating these sounds transforms the quality of the atmosphere from material to spiritu-

Traditionally, this was done by regularly reciting scriptures like Ramayana, Mahabharata, Bhagavad Gita and Bhagavata Purana. Our ancient sages and seers have left behind a limitless stock of transcendantal violence. It will be a good behit dental wisdom. It will be a good habit to regularly recite them and apply them in our lives.

Let us remember this immortal advice of Lord Krishna and begin a positive transformation of the world

Necessity is no longer the mother of invention. Rather invention creates necessity. It is a marketer's world. This is not to say that technologies are not needed. They are, but more than that a shift in mindset is needed. Not only our consumption pattern has become faulty, our attitudes have become rigid. We need to reset the attitudes. Already, waste disposal is a major problem and will be the biggest prob-lem in days to come. Plastic waste, electronic waste are issues to be addressed. Similarly, wastage of water and energy has to be cut. And there is enough scope. We must realise that this world is an organic and dynamic system comprising interdependent parts and subparts. Any effect anywhere will lead to a corresponding effect elsewhere and finally the whole syswill follow on its own.

In relentless solemn pursuit of good governance

Head of the department late Dr BK Singh, a learned no-nonsense person, used to teach Public Finance, and Richard and Peggy Musgrave's magnum opus "Public Finance in Theory and Practice" that handled allocative, distributive and stabilisation functions of governments became soft clay in experienced hands of Dr Singh. For instance, he mixed pure, abstract theory with Indian economic scenario reducing indecipherable, semi-mathematical concepts to simple, plain narratives students of above average calibre could easily grasp. One day a fellow student asked him, "Why India all along has problems in all the three areas: resource allocation, distribution of goods and stabilisation of economic activities?" Dr Singh, with absolutely no demur and looking straight at that student's face, responded, "Because either you are incompetent or you are dishonest or you are both." Then finding the student nervous, he explained by "you" he did not mean that student but "clusters of politicians and bureaucrats in charge of governance." Dr Singh's response holds key to

Realities are inseparable part of governance. More so of both bad and good governance. One may wonder what good governance is. One can think of endless indices: rule of law, transparency, responsiveness, equity and inclusiveness, effectiveness, economy and efficiency, accountability, etc. Still more refined approach to understand good governance is given by Gunnar Myrdal in terms of indices that he summed as "instrumental value premises" incorporating elements as varied as per capita income, democracy at the cross-roads, gender equity, power to vote, etc. In common parlance, good governance in the context of fast developing nations like India may be defined as a form of governance characterised by a system of democratic government sponsored welfare offering a guarantee of collective social care to its citizens, while maintaining capitalist system of production. Myrdal's belief was in continuous evolution of welfare state resulting from good governance ultimately leading to formation of what he called, "the people's home". He further desired "a created harmony" and "social convergence" to come into existence due to governmental interventions. Ultimately good governance is all about good politics and One of the areas of politi-

cal economy explored vari-

ously is the relationship

between politics, economics

and policies. Only good politics where political processes

are sorted out quickly and

with gusto and determination

produce enduring policies. A

former Prime Minister once asserted that only fifteen paise of every rupee meant for downtrodden reached them. With such state of affairs during much of the period before Narendra Modi became Prime Minister of the country in 2014, good policies were few and far between. If significant allocations don't reach the targeted groups and disappear in between, it is as much a reflection on bad policies as on bad politics. Corruption pollutes good politics. Jeffery Sachs rightly observes corruption as a poverty trap: poverty causes corruption and corruption causes poverty. That is the fundamental cause of bad politics and bad policies. Added to that, dereliction of duty at various stages, absence of transparency, lack of accountability, inflexibility, circuitous decision-making processes, weak internal evaluation systems and lax and lazy political leadership in various ways hinder smooth working of economy and good governance. There were instances of inefficient expenditure and manpower management in various departments. If prescribed infrastructures in primary schools are not available or doctors/nurses as per norms are not adequately placed in hospitals, or costly equipment is either not installed or if installed, not put to use, or huge time/cost overruns characterise projects both big and small, short and long term, or health sector suffers absenteeism of health workers, how good governance would be delivered is a question none can answer. Good governance cannot be a reality unless at the micro level transparent evaluation of utilisation of allocated resources occurs. To begin with dereliction of duty of

audit requirements from very high positions like that of Chief Secretary/ACS (Home), etc. Responding to requirements of institutions by governmental functionaries is yet another trait of good governance and it was amply evident in Gujarat. Those who believe in self-discipline believe in discipline in society and transparency. It's a corollary. Gujarat under then Chief Minister Narendra Modi became a totally transformed state. The same spirit now extends to India. Let us take a few examples. In less than ten months, 100 crore vaccine doses have been administered. It is largely because of vaccine self-reliance and comprehensive institutional approach to problem solving something the Prime Minister has been supporting wholeheartedly. Look at the collective involvement of doctors, health workers, academia, administrators, scientists, entrepreneurs and government but for whose coordinated efforts this feat would have been impossible. Economists like John Kenneth Galbraith believe that the distinction between microeconomics and macroeconomics should blur and ultimately disappear. This distinction being a legacy of Keynes, on the one hand gave responsibility for overall economic performance to the state while on the other hand left the traditional role of the classical market to the individual sectors of the economy. That segregation ran contrary to good governance. The undoing of it is the sine qua non for good governance. And this is what Prime Minister Modi has achieved. Recently addressing a joint conference of the CVC and the CBI at Kevadia in Gujarat, the Prime Minister stressed that earlier governments had maximum control which led to many wrong practices. Maximum control anywhere is inimical to enhancement of welfare. "We believe in minimum Government and maximum Governance," the Prime Minister reiterated.

Power to the people paves the way for good governance. Under Prime Minister Modi's guidance, the concept has become a reality. Initiatives like JAM (Jan Dhan-Aadhaar-

Mobile) trinity are watershed schemes in empowering the poor. These have resulted in the elimination of middlemen and corrupt practices, and thereby direct benefits reach households without any interruptions. Institutional complexities of socio-economic development - allocation of resources, distributive justice, welfare theory, public economics, ease of business, etc - are resolved at reasonable speed and aggressively. It has led to success felt by men in the street. In 2019, while travelling in Gorakhpur, I asked the driver of the autorickshaw, a fifty-five year old man, "How the present government compares with previ-

ous ones?"

The driver was clear in his mind, "Now people have expectations. They expect betterment. They are hopeful. Previously activities were negligible. We never sensed hands of governance. Thus there were no expectations. Earlier I used to go to my village in Bihar to hand over cash to my family. Now I send it through mobile monthly. I save my wages for the days that were wasted earlier when I went to my village. Saved wages are my savings. The driver indicated, in his own ways, his understanding of psychology of savings. Electronically transferred money systems like mobile transfers and using Aadhaar cut the cost of transferring savings to families. Such savings coupled with the present government's resolve to deliver

have converted low level of expectations into higher ones. High expectations stem when socio-economic activities favourably affect people's life at the lowest ebb in general.

Similarly coming to health sector, Ayushman Bharat: a comprehensive need-based health care service which aims at undertaking pioneering interventions to address the healthcare system (covering prevention, promotion and ambulatory care) at the primary, secondary and tertiary level in a holistic manner, adopts a continuum of care approach: yet another feat on the road to good governance. Digital empowerment of citizens of the country is amazing and citizens across the country can now access electronic and digital services of the Government.

Anyone looking at the website of any scheme realises the presence and value of crucial information about that scheme. People need not run around knocking at different doors for different information. Good economics believes in revealing maximum information to the beneficiaries. Thus at present poor people don't lack critical information about work done by the Government and hence they are sure of what the Government is doing for them under Prime Minister's directions and guidance and what are their rights and how to avail of the services. People believe they cannot be fooled. Earlier these people could be easily led to believe untruths and guided by factors like caste, region, and dominance of certain families in politics, used to place their votes in wrong baskets. But now they know the picture is clear: they vote for honest, transparent, development-focussed government rather than someone of their ethnic group even if voting for ethnic groups enhances chances of corruption and bigotry. People see the focus has been on infrastruc-

ture development and structural reforms. Organisation is one of the most inescapable facts of democracy and contemporary life and the Bharativa Janata Party (BJP) is a big organisation. Democratic style of functioning of the BJP since its inception has permeated into society in the form of good governance. Only a disciplined party can throw disciplined leaders who hand over to the most-needy and the most neglected ones fruits of good governance through democratic means.

Modi" clearly establish how attempts are being made to malign such a courageous and far-sighted leader like him with his novelty of thinking, application of mind and approach. Absence of holistic perception required for judgment about the background against which decisions are taken after serious scrutiny at different levels really needs to be looked into and reassessed by critics. A proper appreciation of good governance as a concept and in practice requires that. Criticism based on far-fetched assumptions results in irrational conclusions which is the root cause of confusion. Task of redefining nationalism in Thailand

 $T^{\mbox{\scriptsize hailand, the land of the ele-}}_{\mbox{\scriptsize phants, situated at the centre of Indo-Chinese peninsula}}$ is engulfed by a chain of fierce protests. The most heartening aspect of the demonstrations is that most of the protests are led by young people who are demanding the repeal of draconian laws, reform of the Thai monarchy and the military government in the country. These protests began in early 2020. The first phase of the anti-government rising started in February 2020, the second phase continued from July to December 2020, the third phase from February to April 2021 and the current phase i.e. the fourth phase, since June 2021.

Thousands of protesters were out on the road last week, demanding the repeal of the notorious Section 112 (Thailand's Lèse-majesté), an infamous law that criminalises the criticism of the king. Article 112 of the Criminal Code of Thailand says that anyone who "defames, insults or threatens the king, the queen or the heir-apparent or the regent" will be punished with a jail

Further, this criminal code has been made more forceful in all the successive constitutions of the country since its inception in 1908. In 1976, the code gave way for more prohibition or restrictions in dealing with the royalty. The code today says: "The king shall be enthroned in a position of revered worship and shall not be violated. No person shall expose the king to any sort of accusation or The Lèse-majesté in

Thailand has increasingly become a terror. There is nothing that clearly explains the highly prohibitive criminal code. There is no definition of insult to monarchy in the code which strengthens the authorities to book anyone under the law. Even the UN reports say that those arrested on the charges of Lèse-majesté can be denied bail and such victims normally languish in the jail for long before the real trial begins. Unfortunately, most of such trials are held in close doors and sometimes in military courts. Therefore, the rights of the defendants are extremely lim-

term between 3 and 15 years. ited in such trials.

However, the anger against the Chan-o-cha government and the royalty are on the rise. The three-finger salute of the blockbuster "Hunger Games" movies are gaining popularity among the young protesters in the country. Interestingly, the May 2014 Thai coup took place in between the release of these movies and the salute was adopted by the protesters. But what this salute means for the anti-government protesters? The three-finger salute indicates the value of freedom, liberty and fraternity in the country. Therefore, the demonstrators are trying to display that they are not the object of tyranny and abuse. Many of them say that they want to fight till the last breath.

The fight is between the Red Shirts, the anti-govern-ment protesters, and the progovernment ones, who are widely recognised with Yellow Shirts. Initially, the Red Shirts were the supporters of the deposed billionaire Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra. He was overthrown in a military coup on September 19,

living in self-imposed exile except for a brief visit to Thailand in 2008. In fact, the Red Shirts compose mainly of rural workers outside the city of Bangkok.

However, this movement has gradually embraced the students, Leftists, and a section of businessmen who see the status quo as attempts by the military and the urban elite to control the Thai political sys-

Finally, for the Red Shirts, these elites are a serious threat to the country's fragile democracy. This movement was launched to oppose the coup of 2006 that overthrew Thaksin from power. And this also had helped later to install Thaksin's sister Yingluck Shinawatra as the Prime Minister of Thailand from 2011 to 2014. She became the first female PM of the country, but she was also removed by an army coup in 2014. Therefore, the elitist Yellow Shirts and the Red

as the monarch of Thailand. Earlier, the king was named as the King of Siam, the old name of Thailand. Further, the name Siam was changed into Thailand on June 23, 1939.

The Thai king is regarded as an avatar of God, probably Lord Rama. As of today, King Vajiralongkorn is known as the Rama X. A man who represents the centuries old Chakri Dynasty is expected to be people-friendly and think about the welfare and development of the country. But what has been observed is his total disregard for democracy. Rather he has offered his full support to the Government of former Army General Prayut Chan-o-cha cum Prime Minister since 2014. Interestingly, Chan-ocha won the general elections in 2019 and became a civilian Prime Minister since then. But deep inside, he is an army man under the guise of a popularly

The road ahead is dark for Thailand. The democracy supporters, the Red Shirts, are going to encounter heavy handed pressure and brutality

And certainly, the King is maintaining his symbolic silence. He is giving full power to the Army-backed Chan-ocha administration to rein in the protesters, particularly anyone who is criticizing or defaming the royalty in public. Whatsoever, it may be, the common Thais are at their


