# I'm full-time, hands-on Cong prez, avers Sonia

**Rahul hints at taking party helm; Cong prez election in Aug-Sept 2022**

The crucial meeting of the Congress Working Committee on Saturday saw Sonia Gandhi asserting herself as a "full-time and hands-on Congress president" and Rahul Gandhi hinting at his return at the helm of the party. The CWC decided to hold the election of Congress president between August 21 and September 20, 2022.

Sonia hit back at critics within the party — the G-23 — who have been pushing for over a year now for an organisational overhaul and a more "visible leadership".

The G-23 is a group of 23 senior leaders, including Ghulam Nabi Azad, Kapil Sibal, Shashi Tharoor, P Chidambaram among others. Since last August, members of the G-23 have been vocal on several party issues, including that of leadership crisis.

"I have always appreciated frankness" and "there is no need to speak to me through

the media," Sonia said at the first offline CWC meeting post-Covid pandemic. Sources said the organisational elections were discussed amid indications that Rahul could return as the party chief same time around next year.

"I am, if you will allow me

to say so, a full-time and hands-on Congress president," Sonia observed.

In the past two years, a large number of young colleagues have taken leadership roles in taking party policies and programmes to the people, she asserted.

Addressing the meeting of the party's highest decision-making body, Sonia also underscored that the entire organisation wants a revival of the party, but this requires unity and keeping the party's interests paramount.

# 2 more martyred; LeT top ultra killed in J&K

**Total 9 Army jawans dead in op to flush out terrorists**

With the recovery of two more bodies from the encounter site in the Nar Khas forest area of Mendhar tehsil in Poonch late on Saturday evening, the death toll of the Indian Army has mounted to nine, including two JCOs and seven other ranks. So far this is the highest toll in any recent counter terrorist operation in Jammu & Kashmir in recent years.

Meanwhile, in a joint operation with the Central forces, the Jammu & Kashmir Police on Saturday avenged the killing of their two colleagues by successfully eliminating one of the top Lashkar-e-Tayyeba commanders, along with his associate, in the Pampore area of South Kashmir's Pulwama district.

The LeT commander, identified as Umar Mushtaq Khandey, had figured in the most wanted list of 10 terrorists prepared by the J&K Police.

In the first incident involving the Army, during the search

operations and a brief firefight with the terrorists, the Army jawans had received critical injuries late on Thursday evening. Two dead bodies were recovered on Friday, while searches continued as one JCO and another jawan was found missing since October 14.

On October 11, five soldiers, including a Junior Commissioner Officer (JCO), were killed in action during an encounter with the terrorists in a thickly forested area of Dera Ki Gali in Surankote tehsil of frontier Poonch district. Among the martyred soldiers three hailed from Punjab and one each from Uttar Pradesh

and Kerala.

Defence PRO Lt-Col Devender Ajay Singh in a statement said, "Subedar Ajay Singh and Naik Harendra Singh of Indian Army were killed in action during search operations being conducted by the Indian Army along with the Jammu & Kashmir Police in densely forested area of Nar Khas forest in Mendhar, Poonch."

Lt-Col Anand said, "Subedar Ajay Singh and Naik Harendra Singh were part of search operations launched by the security forces to flush out terrorists hiding in the forested area."

# Nihang Sikh surrenders for lynching at Singhu border

A Nihang Sikh, Parminder Singh, on Saturday surrendered at a gurdwara before police in Amarkot village in Jandiala Guru area of Amritsar in connection with the Singhu border lynching incident.

A police team had gone to arrest him. He had announced to surrender after paying obeisance at Akal Takht. Parminder Singh allegedly murdered Lakhbir Singh, a drug addict, who it is alleged had committed sacrilege.

Meanwhile, a court in Sonapat on Saturday remanded Sarabjit Singh, arrested in connection with the lynching of Lakhbir Singh at the farmers' protest site at Singhu border, in police custody for seven days, with the accused pointing to the involvement of a few more people in the gruesome killing.

The body of Lakhbir Singh, a labourer from Punjab's Tarn Taran district, was found on Friday tied to a barricade at the Delhi-Haryana border where the anti-farm law protesters have been camping.

# Hindu's body found; B'desh Durga Puja attacks toll rises to 5

The Durga Puja celebrations have concluded in Bangladesh even as another Hindu devotee was found dead on Saturday amid days of communal unrest and violence unleashed by unidentified Muslim bigots who vandalised temples over alleged blasphemy, leading to the deployment of paramilitary forces in more than half of administrative districts. With the latest killing, the death toll during the Durga Puja celebrations across the country has reached five.

Authorities overnight imposed a nationwide security vigil while officials said that initial investigations have thrown up crucial evidence against the perpetrators of violence against the minority Hindu community's Durga Puja. The paramilitary Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) has expanded the vigil from 22 to 34 out of 64 administrative districts.

The elite anti-crime Rapid Action Battalion said it expects to arrest some of the key perpetrators of the sporadic violence which took place in the past three days. Voicing opti-

mism over the investigation, Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal told reporters that "We expect developments of the investigations in the next one or two days".

The police, meanwhile, said that they have recovered the body of a Hindu devotee from a pond near a temple in southeastern Begumganj sub-district of Noakhali.

# Six people dead, dozen reported missing as rain lashes Kerala

At least six people died and a dozen others were missing on Saturday as heavy rain pounded south and central Kerala causing flash floods and landslides in many parts, prompting the State Government to seek the assistance of the defence forces for rescue operations.

Several people have been injured and displaced in rain-related incidents in Kerala where dams in many districts are nearing its full capacity and small towns and villages in the hilly areas are totally cut off from the outside world.

Many hilly areas of Kottayam, Idukki and Pathanamthitta are experiencing situation almost similar to that during the time of devastating floods of 2018 and 2019 but authorities said everything was under control and there was no need for any panic.

However, the rescue teams of the State police and fire force could not reach the affected areas due to floods and adverse weather conditions prevailing there.

# 30% deprived of water, soap at home!

## 2.3 bn vulnerable to Covid across world: UNICEF

Amid Covid-19 pandemic, hand washing has become a new norm to keep the deadly virus at bay, but ironically globally three in 10 people, or 2.3 billion, do not have basic facilities like water and soap available at home, the UNICEF has said, suggesting that the have-nots remain at the risk of getting infected with coronavirus.

The situation is worse in the least developed countries, with over six in 10 people



without access to basic hand hygiene, the UN agency said in a fact sheet on Global Hand Washing Day observed on October 15. The cost to provide hand hygiene in all homes in 46 of the world's least developed countries by 2030 is an esti-

mated at \$11 billion.

Nonetheless, what has come as a relief is that some progress has been made since 2015: The global population with access to basic hand hygiene at home has increased from 5 billion to 5.5 billion, or

from 67 per cent to 71 per cent. However, if current trends persist, 1.9 billion people will still not have access to basic hand hygiene by the end of the decade.

According to the latest estimates, two in five schools worldwide do not have basic hygiene services with water and soap, affecting 818 million students, of which 462 million attend schools with no facility at all. In the least developed countries, seven out of 10 schools have no place for children to wash their hands.

One-third of health care facilities worldwide do not have hand hygiene facilities at points of care where the patient, health care worker, and treatment involve contact with the patient.

# Heart in right place

There are some films which have a great storyline and the makers choose a fantastic subject. The star cast is strong as well, yet there is something missing that refuse to resonate and make it a movie that is par excellence. Rashmi fits this category.

Directed by Akarsh Khurana and produced by Ronnie Screwala, Neha Anand and Pranjal Khandhdiya, the film has heart in the right place. However, what is missing is the soul that puts life into a subject that is sensitive and talks about gender testing for women athletes globally – a subject that has been in debate for years.

Taapsee Pannu, who has done movies like Pink, Badla and Thappad, despite remaining the driving force behind Rashmi Rocket looks totally helpless in the second half of the movie. This is a bit strange since she has shown to be a woman who is strong minded and definitely not someone who will bow down to anybody let alone a bunch of women athletes out to get her. Of course, there is a scene where she hits out but that does nothing to give the impression that she is in any ways the girl that

she was at the start of the movie. And this is where Rashmi Rocket falters. It is strange to see such a U-turn in a character – from a woman who dominates to a woman who is helpless – doesn't fit with her persona and how she was brought up. Then there are other things that don't fit. Take the Bhuj earthquake that finds its way in the film. The 2001 earthquake on January 26 killed more than 20,000 people and injured over 1.5 lakh people is shown in a blasé manner. While it has no bearing on the film or the subject, a two second shot of cracked earth takes away the devastation it left.

But not all is lost. There are some parts of the movie that are truly inspiring – Taapsee Pannu's need to fight against the injustice meted out to her. The strong family backing that she has – from her mother played by Supriya Pathak and husband played by Priyanshu Painyuli. Both have done a great job here. Mohan Joshi does his bit too even if his screen presence is for 10 minutes.

It is Abhishek Banerjee who needs a special mention here. He plays a funny part serious lawyer with great aplomb. His blundering, at the start, are endearing like where he addresses the judge as ma'am instead of Your Honor. If you are a Taapsee Pannu fan, you will like this.

# ‘Daily soaps are all about how you live on a day-to-day basis’

NARENDRA GUPTA who plays Newton Chattopadhyay in &TV's *Mauka-E-Vardaat* – Operation Vijay talks to SUPRIYA RAMESH about his character, why he agreed to the role and how much work goes into playing a crime genre

#### ■What is Mauka-E-Vardaat – Operation Vijay about?

It is self defining. A band of Indian officers detect a crime and try to nab culprits and they do it successfully. I play the role of a scientist, who is the brains and helps the Indian officers. He draws conclusions from the past and present to guide and help the officers.

#### ■ Tell us about your role?

Its a very different role. I play a scientist who lives away from reach. Nobody knows my whereabouts and contact information. But the main character Newton Chattopadhyay knows everything and keeps track of everything. While doing so if something goes south, he appears suddenly and guides people. He is an expert who doesn't get himself involved but is always on standby. He is like a father figure, professor, friend, scientist. He is the amalgamation of everything, every emotion.

#### ■What made you say yes to this role?

I agreed to this role because this character is with them and still not with them. When I'm shooting, I'm at my den and from there itself I'm explaining things to other characters and that too without seeing them. It's a different type of challenge. Most times in acting, there is another artist with whom you give and take dialogues. I react to these dialogues on the fly and it is pretty challenging. There are certain instances where I suddenly appear somewhere and then disappear from there after finishing my dialogue. Very knowledgeable, it is a character that I haven't portrayed so I have accepted it and I'm enjoying while finding it interesting. I'm sure.



#### ■What does 'Aalokik Shaktiyan' mean here?

Aalokik shaktiya refers to the powers that are beyond our regular scientific reach and understand. "Lok" means people and "lokik" means where people are from. "Aalokik" means something that isn't from where people live. For example, superhuman capabilities. The spiritual powered that aren't discovered yet but loosely based on scientific terms. The main agonist and antagonist keep finding new powers like these. To produce these thoughts realistically, is very challenging

because it's beyond our imagination. The antagonist has these "aalokik shaktiya" but the protagonists use their cunning and the current superior technology to equalize the situation. They don't have the luxury of exemplary powers but they have their courage, Braun and attitude to change the tides.

#### ■You have mostly been a part of the crime genre be it series or a movie. What are the challenges?

Daily soaps are all about how you live on a day to day

basis and react accordingly. Whereas in crime shows, you have to take care of a specific story, crime and genre. You have to showcase your emotions differently and have a realistic approach about the detection of the crime. It's different because of the increase in intuitiveness and overall information.

#### ■We understand that you have also worked in Bollywood movies. How is the work environment different?

For an actor, working in films or working in television or any media is the same. But there are certain limitations and aspects with acting in every media. If you talk about acting in films, there is no limitation in the sense of time constraint. The same can't be said about acting in television because every episode has one. You have to edit it and telecast it in planned schedules. It's a good challenge as there is less time for relaxation. You're always shooting on time and procrastinating has no place here no matter what. The channel cannot go blank on that day.

#### ■How was shooting in a pandemic different?

In the pandemic, there are not many people on set that used to be. There are many protocols in place that prohibit the interaction of multiple people together. The workload has increased but as many actors take initiative and do some things themselves. We have to help each other and share responsibilities. There is no crowding and audiences because of these important restrictions. We all are very happy that we are able to work while keeping each other safe by following these rules.



# City’s air quality starts deteriorating, AQI crosses 300

Air quality in Delhi started deteriorating as the overall Air Quality Index (AQI) recorded 304 microgram/cubic on Thursday.

Mentioning the highest stubble fire count, SAFAR, a unit of Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES) said, “14 per cent of fire incident recorded in neighbouring States of Delhi – National Capital Region (NCR).”

“With 1572 effective fire counts as per SAFAR harmonised methodology which includes data of two ISRO satellites, the stubble burning contribution in Delhi’s air has suddenly increased to 14%.

Fire counts are gradually increasing and wind direction is favorable and coming from North-west direction at transport level (900 mb) for intrusion,” It added.

The pollution monitoring agency, SAFAR, in air quality forecast said that under the influence of approaching western disturbance, wind reversal to easterly will happen by Sunday (October 17).” “Rain is likely and Air quality Index (AQI) is forecast to improve but will remain in poor category however it is likely to be moderate for next three days.”

Sharing satellite images of stubble fire in neighbouring states on micro - blogging website, Delhi Chief Minister



Arvind Kejriwal tweeted: “stubble fire on Oct 13 and Oct 16.”

Meanwhile according to SAFAR, values of harmful

Meteorological Department (IMD).

SAFAR warned as concentration of Particulate Matter (PM) 2.5 was recorded 125 micrograms per cubic and PM 10 was 253 on the National

Ambient Air Quality Index (NAAQI).

As Stubble fire count has been considered major reason for polluting air in the National Capital, Delhi Government, earlier, had appealed to the

Chief Ministers and governments of neighbouring states and Centre to provide free Pusa -made decomposer. City government has also prepared a green war room to deal with air pollution problem. Besides,

government will start ‘Red Light on, Gadi (Vehicle) off’ campaign to reduce vehicular pollution; moreover, anti-dust campaign also in Delhi.

Remark : STUBBLE IMPACT is high.

## Light rain for next 3 days, predicts IMD

**New Delhi:** The National Capital Region (NCR) woke up to a clear sky on Saturday with the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) forecasting light rain or thundershowers towards the evening or night for the next three days.

The department also predicted that the rain for the next three days will bring down the temperature in the capital and pave way for winter chills.

The precipitation will also improve Delhi’s air quality.

The Department has also issued a yellow alert for Sunday and Monday with the possibility of light rain at some places on Saturday. It has pegged the maximum temperature for the day at 34 degrees Celsius and minimum at 20 degrees Celsius for the day. The relative humidity has been recorded at 82 per



cent.

According to the System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting And Research (SAFAR), the Air Quality Index (AQI) is ‘poor’ in the national capital. It has forecasted a moderate advisory for the level of PM 10 pollutants at 238 and,

poor for PM 2.5 at 112.

According to the National Air Quality Index of Central Pollution Control Board data of 10 a.m., the AQI at Anand Vihar stands at 306, meaning ‘very poor’, that of ITO is at 226 - ‘poor’. 198 i.e. moderate at RK Puram.

## GRAP imposed to curb pollution in G’gram

**Gurugram:** To curb pollution in the city, the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) has been implemented in Gurugram from Friday. After this, all the departments of the city have become active to curb pollution in Gurugram.

Officials said after the implementation of the GRAP, the construction material in the city will have to be covered, activities responsible for pollution will be stopped and if someone is found disobeying GRAP norms, will be fined.

However, despite this, the people are facing problems due to the piles of rubble lying all across the city.

In connection with the matter, during the Municipal Corporation Gurugram (MCG), a house meeting, the MCG councillors had also sought answers from the corporation officials regarding the Construction and Waste (C&D) issue, on which the offi-

cials had said the debris from the city will be lifted in two days, but even after the commencement of the corporation councillors, the lifting of construction waste from the city is yet to be started.

Municipal Commissioner Mukesh Kumar Ahuja told the councillors that a meeting with the company responsible for C&D waste will be held to resolve the matter.

However, the commissioner had talked with the company and starting work on it soon. But till now no solution has been found for this problem.

Notably, a private agency has been hired by the MCG to lift the debris from the city, but even after spending crores, the C&D waste can be seen in several locations of the city. Officials said more than two thousand tonnes of debris is coming out of the city every day, but it is neither being dis-

posed of nor the piles of debris lying in public places are being transported to the identified places of the corporation.

“So far, the lifting of the piles of rubble lying all over the city has not started. The officers are working with their dictatorship, no attention is being paid to the demands of the councillors. If there is a provision to impose a fine as per the GRAP, then why is the corporation not being challenged on C&D waste,” Ashwani Sharma, Ward-19 Councillor said.

“Wherever there is debris lying in public places, those places will be marked and sprinkled with water tankers will be done. The company’s capacity to lift debris is 300 tonnes per day, but the city is getting more debris daily. In such a situation, water will be sprinkled there by following the rules of GRAP,” Hari Om Attri, Joint Commissioner, Headquarters, MCG said. SR



## City reports 21 new Covid cases

The national capital reported 21 new cases on Saturday while the positivity rate stood at 0.04 per cent, according to a health bulletin issued by the health department of the Delhi Government.

The number of active cases decreased to 326 on Saturday from 327 a day before, according to the bulletin. The number of people under home isolation stood at 96 on Saturday while it was 104 a day before, and the number of containment zones increased to 104 from 99 on Friday, the bulletin said.

A total of 48,870 tests -- 43,504 RT-PCR tests and 5,366 rapid antigen tests -- were conducted a day ago, the bulletin said.

According to the bulletin, the Covid case tally in Delhi reached 1439358 of which over 14.13 lakh patients have recovered. The death toll has risen to 25,089.



On April 20, Delhi had reported 28,395 cases, the highest in the city since the beginning of the pandemic last year. On April 22, the case positivity rate was 36.2 per cent, the highest so far.

The highest number of 448 deaths was reported on

May 3. The Delhi government has been ramping up the health infrastructure in the city to prevent a repeat of the crisis witnessed during the peak of the second wave.

Two fatalities due to COVID-19 have been recorded so far this month in Delhi,

on October 2 and 10, according to official data.

The Delhi Government has taken steps to increase the number of hospital beds to accommodate up to 37,000 patients a day and to become self-reliant in terms of oxygen supply.

## Cousin held for raping teen after 2 months

**New Delhi:** The Delhi Police arrested a man for raping a minor girl in Kotla Mubarakpur area of South Delhi. A woman had lodged a complaint at the KM Pur police station that around 2 months ago when she came back to Delhi from her native village in Uttar Pradesh, her 15-year-old daughter told her that while she was alone at home one afternoon, she was raped by her cousin.

The accused had also threatened her not to disclose about the incident, the police said on Saturday.

As per the statement of the victim, an FIR was registered on Thursday under sections 376, 506 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and section 4 of the POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) Act and the accused has been arrested, the police said. Further investigation is underway. IANS

## Drone warfare new challenge, we are capable to handle it, says NSG DG

**Manesar (Gurugram):** National Security Guard (NSG) DG MA Ganapathi on Saturday said that drone warfare is a new challenge and the NSG is fully capable to handle it. He was speaking on the sidelines of the 37th foundation day event of the NSG, here on Saturday.

“Every security force needs to upgrade counter drone technology. Drones are an easy way to create mischief, to drop bombs and payload like weapons and ammunition,” he said. Earlier, speaking at the 37th foundation day of the NSG, the DG said that the NSG has been upgrading itself to the new security challenges and in the last few years, many initiatives have been taken to strengthen the counter terror measures.

“To effectively deal with drone attacks, the Force is now equipped with counter drone equipment, radar, jammers and drone killing guns”, Ganapathi

said.

Referring to the upgradation of the force in the last one year, he further said that in light of the drone attacks on Jammu airport recently, the Counter terrorism Commando forces of NSG, equipped with anti-drone technology, been deployed at the Jammu and Srinagar airports to provide anti-drone cover to these vital installations.

The force has also destroyed the IEDs and tiffin box bombs sent across the border through drones in Amritsar in Punjab, he added.

The NSG DG further said that the Force has been equipped with modern weapons and equipment and also strengthened the infrastructural setups across the country and indoor shooting ranges have been established in Manesar, Delhi, Hyderabad, Mumbai and Kolkata.

With an aim to increase the efficiency of the bomb dispos-

al squads, mini-remotely operated vehicles, total containment vehicles, and robots have been added to the force, he added.

He also said that to deal with multiple attacks at multiple locations at the same time, the Gandiv 3 mock exercise was conducted last month and in coordination with all agencies, and forces were dispatched to Bhopal, Ahmedabad from Delhi for this exercise.

Ganapathi also said that NSG’s Close Protection Force has provided security to the VVIPs in over 4,600 events in the last one year despite Covid-19 restrictions and also provided security to the VVIPs in over 260 public gatherings and road shows during the last assembly elections.

He also said all NSG personnel have been fully vaccinated for Covid-19 and a 60 bedded hospital has been set up at NSG campus here with its own resources. IANS

## Manmohan diagnosed with dengue, gradually improving: AIIMS

**New Delhi:** Former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh has been diagnosed with dengue, but his health condition is gradually improving and is out of danger, an AIIMS official said on Saturday.

The official said that the former Prime Minister’s “platelets are increasing and is out of danger now”.

The veteran Congress leader was admitted to the AIIMS on Wednesday evening after he complained of fever and weakness.

Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya also visited him and enquired about his health.

A team of doctors, under the guidance of Nitish Nayak, a well-known cardiologist, are attending on the former Prime Minister.

He had developed fever three days ago and was feeling weak after which he was rushed to AIIMS.

Singh had tested positive for Covid-19 in April this year during the second wave of the pandemic and had been admitted to the AIIMS. IANS

## Devotees immerse Durga idols in Yamuna despite ban

**New Delhi:** Despite ban on idol immersion in Yamuna river and other natural water bodies in the national Capital, several people flouted the rules issued by the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC), a day before the ‘visarjan’ (immersion) ritual.

Yamuna Ghat at the ITO was found littered with idols and other religious materials on Saturday morning.

DPCC in its October 13 order had ruled that idol immersion during Durga Puja and other forthcoming festivals in any public place, including river Yamuna or any other water body, ponds and ghats, should not be allowed.

“Consequent pollution of such water bodies has been a matter of concern. In addition

to silting, toxic chemicals used in making idols tend to leach out and pose serious problems of water pollution. Studies carried out to assess deterioration in water quality due to idol immersion reveal the deterioration of water quality in respect to conductivity, biochemical oxygen demand and heavy metal concentration,” the order read.

The DPCC had ruled that idol immersion rituals may be performed in a bucket and container within the home premises. Convener of Yamuna Jiye Abhiyan, Manoj Mishra, told IANS, “The prohibition of idol immersion in any public place including Yamuna imposed by DPCC is a welcome step especially in view of idols made of Plaster of Paris (PoP) or paint-

ed with lead-based paints. But it is hardly a measure to rejuvenate the river which is already overloaded with sewage and toxic pollutants from industries.”

The DPCC had directed the District Magistrates to enforce guidelines related to idol immersion, adding that each violator will be liable to pay Rs 50,000 to the DPCC body.

River Yamuna whose catchment covers parts of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh in addition to that of Delhi, is most polluted in and around the national capital. Its top pollution sources are the Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs), untreated water from unauthorised colonies as well as sewer from authorised colonies.

However, a clean and pollution-free Yamuna has been the poll promise of Delhi government for more than 25 years now.

The first Yamuna Action Plan (YAP) for which a loan agreement was signed in 1992, aimed at improved water quality conservation and hygienic environment in the river basin. IANS



## CM: Haryana will come up with new policy to issue electricity connections in private developer colonies

The State Government is soon going to formulate a policy for such colonies developed by private developers in Gurugram where permanent and temporary electricity connections are not being provided due to a lack of infrastructure. This policy will give relief to the people living in private developer colonies.

This announcement was made by Haryana Chief Minister, Manohar Lal Khattar while presiding over the monthly meeting of District Public Relations and Grievance Redressal Committee in Gurugram on Saturday.

A total of 17 problems or complaints were placed in the meeting, out of which the CM resolved most of them on the spot. Apart from these, during the meeting, the District Sports Officer was called after a problem related to sports in village Khandevala, but he was found absent in the meeting without any information, taking it seriously, the Chief Minister immediately ordered his suspension.

16 private developer colonies in Gurugram including Sushant Lok-1,2 & 3, Palam



Vihar, South City-1 & 2, Malibu Town, Aardee City, Mayfield Garden, Uppal Southend, Suncity, Vipul World, Saraswati Kunj due to the lack of infrastructure, the matter of stopping the provision of permanent and temporary electricity connections to the consumers was taken up with the Chief Minister.

On this, the CM said that a new policy is being made for such consumers by grouping three types so that relief can be provided to the people living in those colonies. He told that the consumers who have deposited all the EDC money with the developer, that money will be removed from the developer to

the lack of infrastructure and connections will be issued to the consumers.

Similarly, the consumers whose EDC money is pending will be given the connections after completing the infrastructure by filling that amount.

While disposing of the complaint regarding the lack of infrastructure like electricity, water, roads etc. in DLF Phase-3, Khattar asked the representative of DLF to hand over the colony to the Municipal Corporation Gurugram (MCG) on December 31 by removing the lack of infrastructure.

After that, the MCG will survey the deficit infrastructure

in the next 15 days and if any deficiency is found, then it will be given to DLF by making an estimate.

According to the estimate, DLF will have to deposit the amount so that the corporation will remove that shortfall. On the same lines, action will be taken in 14 other colonies of Gurugram. The Chief Minister said that in the case of those colonies, the tripartite agreement should be made in which the MCG, the concerned developer and the District Town Planner (DTP) would be involved and the responsibility of getting the infrastructure completed as per the rules would rest with the DTP.



# Kerala records 7,995 new Covid cases, 57 deaths

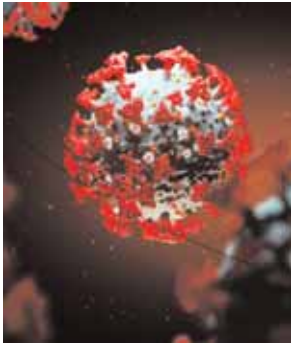
**Thiruvananthapuram:** Kerala reported 7,995 new positive cases and 57 Covid-19 -related deaths on Saturday, taking the total affected in the state to 48,37,560 and the death toll to 26,791.

State Health Minister Veena George said 79,722 samples were tested in the last 24 hours and there are 211 wards across 158 local self government bodies with a weekly infection population ratio above ten per cent.

Among the districts, Ernakulam reported the highest number of fresh infections--1,280, followed by Thiruvananthapuram with 985 and Kozhikode 937.

"There are 90,885 active Covid-19 cases of which only 9.8 per cent are admitted to hospitals," the minister said in a release.

Meanwhile, 11,769 persons recuperated from the disease, taking the total cured to



47,28,497.

According to the release, of those found infected today, 27 reached the state from outside while 7,562 contracted the disease through their contact. The source of infection of 321 persons is yet to be traced and 45 health workers are also among the infected.

Currently, there are 3,14,640 people under observation of which 10,404 are in isolation wards of various hospitals. **PTI**

According to a Hindu community leader, the deceased was a victim of bigot attacks on devotees on Friday.

Four people were killed and scores of others injured during clashes between Muslim bigots and the police at Hajiganj sub-district in central Chandpur on Wednesday and Thursday, prompting the government to call out paramilitary forces to maintain law and order across the country.

On Thursday, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina promised to bring to justice the culprits behind the violence, saying anyone involved in the attacks on Hindu temples and Durga Puja venues in Comilla will not be spared.

"The incidents in Comilla are being thoroughly investigated. Nobody will be spared. It doesn't matter which religion they belong to. They will be hunted down and punished," she said while exchanging greetings with the Hindu community members during an event at Dhakeshwari National Temple in Dhaka on the occasion of Durga Puja.

The violence had erupted after an alleged blasphemy incident at a Durga Puja pavilion in Cumilla, bordering Chandpur and about 100 kms from Dhaka, after which a probe was launched.

"Global response efforts to the pandemic have created an unprecedented time for hand hygiene. Yet progress remains far too slow for the most vulnerable, underserved communities," Unicef WASH Director Kelly Ann Naylor was quoted as saying in a statement. "Hand hygiene cannot be viewed as a temporary provision to manage Covid-19. Further long-term investment in water, sanitation and hygiene can help prevent the next health crisis from coming. It also means fewer people falling ill with respiratory infections, fewer children dying from diarrhoea diseases, and more pregnant mothers and newborns protected from preventable conditions like sepsis."

# Gujarat: Eight students test +ve at tuition centre in Surat

Surat city has so far reported 1,11,669 coronavirus positive cases and 1,09,975 recoveries, with a recovery rate of 98.48 per cent. A total of 1,629 Covid-19 patients have died so far in Surat, as per the latest bulletin released by the municipal corporation. **PTI**

# I insisted that Uddhav become CM of Maha: Pawar Dismisses Fadnavis charge that Uddhav was ambitious to become CM

The political temperature increased in Maharashtra on Saturday, as NCP chief Sharad Pawar dismissed BJP leader and former chief minister Devendra Fadnavis' charge that Shiv Sena president Uddhav Thackeray was "ambitious" to become the chief minister and became one as "baseless" and said that it was he who "forced" Uddhav to occupy the post.

Hitting out at Fadnavis for his claim that Uddhav had fulfilled his "ambition" of becoming the Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Pawar said: "There is no truth in Fadnavis' charge. At a time when he was not interested in becoming the chief minister, it was I who proposed his name and got it approved by the MLAs present at the meeting of the legislators of Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress".

He (Fadnavis) should know that I played a role in the formation of Maha Vikas Aghadi government (comprising Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress). There were three

names for the post of chief minister. But, the name of Uddhav Thackeray did not figure in the list. Uddhav was not ready to become the chief minister..I had close relations with his father late Sena chief Bal Thackeray. Late Thackeray has contributed a great deal to Maharashtra. Keeping this in mind, it was I who forced Uddhav to become the chief minister," the NCP chief said, while talking to media persons at Pimpri in Pune district. Pawar was defending Uddhav against the criticism of Fadnavis who had earlier in the day charged that the MVA government was formed "dishonestly" by the Shiv Sena in alliance with the NCP and Congress and that Uddhav severed the Sena's links with the BJP as he was "ambitious" to become the chief minister, an ambition the latter fulfilled when the MVA Government came to power in November 2019.

Fadnavis -- in his interaction with the media in Nagpur -- had taken on Uddhav in response to a sensational statement made by the latter at his Dussehra rally on Friday

that had the BJP fulfilled its pre-Assembly poll promise of giving the CM's post to his party, he would have perhaps stepped aside, made Shiv Sainik the chief minister and even retired from politics.

"If the BJP had fulfilled its promise of giving (the first term) of the chief ministership, I would have perhaps stepped aside, made a Shiv Sainik the chief minister and even retired from politics. I am being criticised in politics. This is not my field. I came here to fulfil the responsibility as a son (of late Balasaheb Thackeray). I will not keep quiet till I fulfil my responsibility. It is with this intent that I am here," Uddhav had said.

Slamming the BJP for calling the Shiv Sena corrupt after the two parties' alliance ended in 2019, Uddhav dared it to topple his Sena-NCP-Congress coalition government which will complete two years next month.

"I do not go after anyone. But, if someone targets me, I would not spare them. What is your stature to attack me? If you have some strength in you to take on me directly, please do

it. But, do not use CBI, ED and IT to hand over threats to me. If you take on directly, I will retaliate as the Shiv Sena and not as the chief minister. Unlike you, I am not the one to hide behind police or enforcement agencies. I will do whatever I can through my Shiv Sainiks," Uddhav had said.

Alluding to Fadnavis' charge that some ministers in the MVA government possessed a software that enabled them to "extort" money, the NCP chief said: "Fadnavis talks about computer chip that enables ministers to extort money from people. If there is indeed such a software, I want him to show that would enrich our knowledge".

Defending Uddhav's style of functioning as the chief minister, Pawar said: "When I used to be chief minister, I would rush to the spot whenever there was a big incident. Uddhav is different. He handles crises well by not stirring out of the place. Maharashtra has faced so many crises, including floods and Covid-19, Uddhav and his colleagues have effectively handled all the crises.

Uddhav has proved that he can handle difficult situation even while working from home. Hence there is absolutely no truth in Fadnavis' allegation."

Referring to Fadnavis' "baseless" allegations against Uddhav and MVA Government, Pawar said: "I have not read any statement that augurs well for a leader of the Opposition in the Assembly. Fadnavis is frustrated because he is not in power. He has said that he feels he is a chief minister even now. Looks like he will not quiet till he become a chief minister. That's why keeps saying anything that comes to his mind".

"For instance, Fadnavis has said that he will not allow Maharashtra to go West Bengal way. Is he suggesting that he would not allow the contributions by great personalities like Ravidranath Tagore and Subhash Chandra Bose and that he would not allow such patriots in Maharashtra? The man who was the chief minister of one state should not be talking about the other state in this manner," the NCP chief said.

"On October 14, 2021 after a fierce firefight with terrorists, the communication with Subedar Ajay Singh and Naik Harendra Singh was disrupted. Relentless operations continued to neutralise the terrorists and to re-establish communication with the soldiers. Subedar Ajay Singh and Naik Harendra Singh were killed in action in the fierce fight and their bodies have been recovered in the evening of 16 Oct 21," he added.

Subedar Ajay Singh is a resident of village - Rampur, Post- Jajal, Tehsil- Narendra Nagar, District - Tehri, Uttarakhand.

Naik Harendra Singh is a native of village - Pipalsari, Post- Rikhnikhil, Tehsil- Lansdowne, District - Pauri, Uttarakhand. To prevent further loss of lives of the Indian Army jawans, the elite para commandos have directed to neutralise the group of terrorists hiding in the thickly forested area. The elite commandos were earlier inducted into the operations keeping in mind the difficult terrain and thick foliage.

After a brief lull since last evening, fresh contact was established with the terrorists on Saturday. The exchange of fire also took place for some time, but the terrorists continued to remain at large even on the sixth day of the operations.

Deputy Inspector General (Rajouri Poonch range) Vivek Gupta told reporters in Poonch that the counter terrorist operation is going on in the thickly forested area of Mendhar tehsil in Poonch. He said the joint grid of the security forces was tracking the terrorists in the area for over two months now.

"So far the security forces have established contact with the terrorists on three occasions," said Vivek Gupta, adding, "We have managed to

hold these terrorists in a particular area and following all the Sop's in order to neutralise these terrorists as soon as possible." He said the traffic in the area has been diverted to ensure safety of the commuters.

Meanwhile, after the targeted killings of civilians in different parts of Kashmir valley the security forces have adopted an aggressive posturing. Since October 8, 13 terrorists have been neutralised in nine encounters.

Hitting back, terrorists shot dead two non-locals labourers, hailing from Hindi heartland states of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh were shot dead in Srinagar and Pulwama districts late Saturday evening .

According to a spokesman of the Jammu and Kashmir police, terrorists fired upon two nonlocal labourers in Srinagar & Pulwama late Saturday evening.

The non-locals have been identified as Arvind Kumar Shah of Banka Bihar and Sagir

Ahmad of Saharanpur in UP.

Arvind Kumar was targeted in the Eidgah area of Srinagar and was rushed to the SMHS hospital where doctors declared him brought dead while Sagir was targeted in Pulwama area.

In a tweet Kashmir Zone Police said, "LeT terrorist Umar Mustaq Khandey who martyred our two colleagues SgtCT Mohd Yousf and Ct Suhail Ah-in Baghat, Srinagar while they were having tea, was neutralised in Drangbal, Pampore. Amongst various other crimes of the terrorists, this stands out as most unforgivable."

On the other hand, Inspector General of Police Kashmir range Vijay Kumar on Saturday ruled out any security lapse behind the recent civilian killings in the valley and said it is not possible to provide security to all those who may be soft targets for terrorists.

Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of a function here, Inspector General of Police

(IGP), Kashmir, Vijay Kumar, said none of the civilians killed last week had been provided security by the police.

Seven civilians, including four from minority communities, were killed by terrorists in Kashmir last week, triggering fear among the people in the Valley and criticism of the security apparatus by political parties. "There was no lapse in security", They (terrorists) chose soft targets, we had not provided security to them (civilians). It is not possible to provide security to all soft targets," Kumar said.

He said security forces acted swiftly and identified all five terrorists involved in the killings.

"Two of them have been neutralised and the other three will also be tracked down soon," he added.

Dismissing criticism of the security apparatus by politicians, Kumar said the police are dealing with the situation professionally.

"Above all, it requires self-control and discipline," she said amidst the demand from senior leaders like AK Antony as well as Chief Ministers of Punjab, Rajasthan, and Chhattisgarh to bring back Rahul as the chief of the grand old party.

News agency ANI, quoting sources said that on the insistence of senior leaders at the CWC meeting, Rahul said that he "will consider" becoming the party president again. The CWC decided that elections for the top post will be held between August 21 and September 20 next year and the next chief could take the baton by October 2022. It emerged during the course of the discussion that there should not be any immediate changes in top leadership due to the impending crucial Assembly elections, including that of Uttar Pradesh and Punjab next year.

After a nearly five-hour-long meeting of the CWC, AICC general secretary (organisation)

K C Venugopal announced the election schedule, which includes a massive membership drive for the polls starting from November 1, 2021, and will go on till March 31, 2022.

At a Press conference, Venugopal also stated that the election of PCC presidents, vice presidents, treasurers, PCC executives, and AICC members by the PCC general body will be held between July 21 and August 20, 2022. The election of the Congress president will be held between August 21 and September 20, 2022, he said.

Speaking at the press conference Congress chief spokesperson Randeep Surjewala said all members of the CWC have reassured their full faith in Sonia and her leadership.

On being asked whether Rahul can become the party's president before the organisational elections, Surjewala said, "The dates have been already announced, any changes that take place will happen accordingly."

to me through the media. So let us all have a free and honest discussion. But what should get communicated outside the four walls of this room is the collective decision of the CWC," Sonia noted in her opening remarks.

Talking about the party's revival, a key theme raised by the G-23, she said, "The entire organisation wants a revival of the Congress. But this requires unity and keeping the party's interests paramount. Above all, it requires self-control and discipline. "Never have we let issues of public importance and concern go unaddressed. You are aware that I have been taking them up with the Prime Minister as have Dr Manmohan Singh and Rahul ji. I have been interacting with like-minded political parties regularly. We have issued joint statements on national issues and coordinated our strategy in Parliament as well."

The CWC also passed three resolutions, including a political calling upon all democratic parties and forces to join hands to resolutely oppose the Modi

Government in order to protect the values on which our country was founded and to advance the causes of the people.

Sonia also spoke about the Lakhimpur Kheri incident, the farmers' agitation, inflation, foreign policy and the continuing border stand-off with China, targeted killing in Jammu and Kashmir and the disinvestment process. One of the resolutions was on agrarian distress and the CWC mentioned, "We reiterate our continued resolve to fight the battle alongside the farmers and farm labourers to defeat the Modi Government's deliberate attack on India's Anndatas." The CWC also urged the Centre to 'take immediate steps to reduce prices' as part of a resolution on inflation during the meeting. Regarding the same, the Opposition party also announced to undertake mass agitation on price rise between Nov 14 and 29.

"All supporters and leaders will take up padyatras to polling booths. This will be followed by mass meetings," said Venugopal.

# Navy to review its readiness on Mon

The Navy top echelon will next week review the readiness of its fleet in the backdrop of China flexing its maritime muscle in the Indian Ocean and Indo-Pacific. The five-day Commanders' conference will commence here from Monday. Giving details here on Saturday, Navy officials said the conference, held twice a year, serves as a platform for Naval Commanders to discuss important maritime matters at the military-strategic level as well as interact with senior Government officials through an institutionalised forum. Due to the rapidly changing geostrategic situation of the region, the significance and importance of the Conference is manifold. It is an institutionalised platform to deliberate, direct, devise and decide issues of utmost importance, which will shape future course of the Indian Navy.

During the Conference, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will address and interact with the Naval Commanders on matters pertaining to national security. Among many issues being discussed, the Chief of the Naval Staff, along with other Naval Commanders, will review major operational, materiel, logistics, human resource development, training and administrative activities undertaken by the Indian Navy in the last few months and deliberate upon future plans for important activities and initiatives. The Navy has focused on being Combat Ready, Credible and Cohesive force and despite the Covid-19 pandemic, continues to assiduously execute its mandate. The Indian Navy has witnessed a significant growth in its operational tasking over the years in consonance with India's rising maritime interests. Indian Naval ships on

Mission Based Deployments across the Indian Ocean Region (IOR) have remained poised for quick response to any developing situation. Indian warships deployed in the Gulf of Aden and the Persian Gulf continue to provide security for trade flowing through these areas. In 2020-21, warships have undertaken multiple Covid related outreach missions to provide food and medical aid to IOR littoral nations and beyond as part of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region). The Chief of Defence Staff, and the Chiefs of Indian Army and Indian Air Force will also interact with the Naval Commanders to address convergence of the three Services vis-à-vis the operational environment, and on avenues for augmenting Tri-Service synergy.

## Air chief to visit forward areas along LoC to assess operational preparedness

Indian Air Force (IAF) chief VR Chaudhari is visiting forward areas along the Line of Actual Control (LoC) in Ladakh to review operational readiness of the armed forces. This is his first visit after assuming the top job earlier this month. The visit comes at a time when India and China are in a stand-off situation at some locations in Eastern Ladakh since May last year. The two Corps Commanders have held 13 rounds of talks to ease tension at the LoC and find ways for early disengagement from the flash points. Chaudhari arrived in Leh on Saturday and will visit forward areas. He will also hold talks with the operational commanders of the IAF and the Army to take a sense of the situation there. Even though Chaudhari took over as the IAF chief recently, he was handling the LoC flare up and resultant build up to protect the LoC as the Western Air Command chief and then as the Vice-Chief. During the ongoing visit, Chaudhari will visit the forward air bases in the Ladakh region besides some positions where the troops are deployed to thwart any transgressions by the Chinese troops, sources said here on Saturday.



The IAF has also upgraded its facilities in the northern sector where troops have been stationed with the surface-to-air missiles to counter even slow moving helicopters. The Air Force has also deployed the Rafale fighter aircraft along with the MiG-29 fighters to guard the LoC. In fact, the IAF has deployed all its front line fighter jets including the SU-30s and Jaguars at the airbases near the 4,000 KM LoC stretching from Ladakh in the north to Arunachal Pradesh in the east since June last year. At present, more than 50,000 troops each from India and China are deployed along the LoC in Eastern Ladakh since May last year. The two sides did not retreat in the winter months and are likely to stay put at all the flash points during the coming winter months. Army Chief General M M Naravane had visited the LoC for two days on October one to take stock of the operational preparedness of his troops. He reportedly also reviewed the preparations for deploying troops in the winter months.

# Jaishankar to visit Israel to strengthen bilateral ties

In a move to further strengthen ties between the two countries, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will visit Israel and hold talks with his counterpart there on the entire gamut of relationship. The three-day visit begins on October 19. The two countries have robust strategic and defence ties and Jaishankar and his Israeli counterpart Yair Lapid will focus to strengthen the strategic partnership. This will be Jaishankar's first visit to the country as External Affairs Minister. The Ministry of External Affairs said here in a statement on Saturday Jaishankar will pay an official visit to Israel at the invitation of Alternate Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Lapid. He will hold a bilateral meeting with Lapid and will also call on President Isaac Herzog, Prime Minister Naftali Bennett, and Knesset Speaker Mickey Levy during his visit. India and Israel elevated bilateral relations to a strategic partnership during the historic visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to Israel in July 2017. Since then, the relationship between the two countries has focused on expanding knowl-

edge-based partnership, which includes collaboration in innovation and research, including boosting the 'Make in India' initiative, the ministry said. During his visit, Jaishankar will interact with the Indian-origin Jewish community in Israel, Indologists, Indian students who are currently pursuing their education in Israeli universities, and business people, including from the hi-tech industries, the statement said. The visit will also be an occasion to pay tribute to the valiant Indian soldiers who laid their lives in the region, especially during the First World

War, it said. The visit is seen towards cementing diplomatic and political ties between the two countries in the post-Benjamin Netanyahu era. Israel has emerged as a major defence partner of India since diplomatic ties were established in the early 1990s. Over the years, Israel has supplied technology for the Indian missile programme, sophisticated rifles, Phalcon airborne early warning radar system (AWACS), drones, sensors and other related equipment. The two countries also share close relationship in fighting terrorism through intelligence sharing and counter-terrorism operations. Jaishankar will first visit Dubai on Sunday and will then leave for Israel. In the United Arab Emirates (UAE), the external affairs minister is likely to hold talks with the leadership there on issues like the situation in Afghanistan. Incidentally, the UAE established diplomatic relations with Israel under the Abraham Accord signed on August 13, 2020.

# NSG commandos deployed at Srinagar, Jammu airbases for anti-drone cover

Units of the National Security Guard (NSG) have been deployed at the Srinagar and Jammu airbases to provide anti-drone cover, paramilitary chief MA Ganapathy said on Saturday. The move comes after Jammu air station was hit by drone attacks earlier this year. The NSG on Saturday celebrated its 37th raising at its campus in Manesar. Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) conspired to execute the first-ever drone attack on June 27 at the Indian Air Force (IAF) station in Jammu where two unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), which came from across the border, dropped bombs, injuring two airmen and damaging a portion of a building. The two IAF facilities in the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir are located close to the Pakistan border/Line of Control (LoC) respectively and are cat-



egorised as 'sensitive' locations. On the NSG Raising Day on Saturday, Union Home Minister Amit Shah greeted the elite counter-terrorism force, terming it is a "world-class trained force to tackle all facets of terrorism" and the country is proud of its troops. The elite striking force, the NSG was established in 1984 after the Union Cabinet decided to create a 'Federal Contingency Force' that was 'well trained to tackle various manifestations of terrorism.

Every year, the Raising Day of the NSG is celebrated on October 16. This year marks the 37th anniversary of the establishment of the NSG, popularly known as Black Cats. "Greetings to our brave NSG personnel on their 37th Raising Day. NSG is a world-class trained force to tackle all facets of terrorism. This formidable force has left no stone unturned to live up to its motto 'Sarvatra Sarvottam Suraksha'. India is proud of NSG black cats," the Home Minister tweet-

# Four CRPF jawans injured in accidental fuse box explosion

Four CRPF jawans were injured when an ammunition fuse box exploded when it was being loaded on a train at the Raipur station on Saturday. The 211 Company of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) was in the train when ammunition was being loaded on Saturday morning, the paramilitary said in a statement. "Boxes of arms and ammunition were being loaded on the train by Head Constable Vikas Lakshman and other jawans. The ammunition fuse box exploded in Lakshman's hand near the toilet of the train's compartment," it said. Due to the fuse box explosion, Lakshman got injured and he was immediately admitted to the Sreenarayana hospital in Raipur. Three other jawans also suffered some injuries and they were given first aid treatment at the station, the statement said. The CRPF said that "a



case has been filed with the GRP railway station and it has directed to investigate the matter". The special train was scheduled to carry the CRPF personnel to Jammu from Raipur, Raipur police said in Chattisgarh capital. "A minor explosion was recorded in a special train of the CRPF at the Raipur railway station around 6.30 am today. The train was heading to Jammu from Jharsuguda (Odisha)," Raipur Superintendent of Police (SP) Prashant Agrawal said.

The spl train was scheduled to carry the CRPF personnel to Jammu from Raipur, Raipur police said in Chattisgarh capital. "The explosion occurred during the shifting of a container carrying detonators and HD cartridges. While shifting the container in train, it accidentally slipped in coach number-9, which led to the blast," the SP added.

# BJP slams Congress for 'not offering any comment' on Singhu border killing of dalit

Lashing out at the Congress for "not offering any comment" on the ghastly killing of a dalit at the Singhu-border, the BJP on Saturday asked the opposition whether it was supporting the "Talibani thinking" and the anti-social elements which are "misusing" farmers protests to further their own vested interests.

Addressing a press conference here, BJP's National Spokesman Gaurav Bhatia also took to task Bhartiya Kisan Union president Rakesh Tikait who is leading the farm stir, for saying that "organisers have no accountability towards the incident". "Have professional protesters no responsibility towards their own citizens?", he asked. Bhatia accused the oppo-

sition, particularly the Congress, of keeping a silence for their "petty and cheap vote-bank politics". "For petty and cheap vote-bank politics, the opposition, particularly the Congress, is maintaining a deafening silence...no courage to call a spade a spade as it does not suit their policies of convenience", he said. On the killing of a dalit on



the Singhu-border, Bhatia wondered whether the Congress is subscribing to the Talibani traditions. BJP leader said the anti-social elements have joined the protest and are firing guns from the shoulders of the agi-

tating farmers. The BJP spokesperson referred to the statement from the Congress Working Committee and said Congress President' Sonia's "silence is dangerous" as the opposition party, he said is otherwise very

quick and regular on raising convenient issues on the farmers. BJP said that "anarchists behind these protests need to be exposed as they are doing a great disservice to the nation". "The professional protesters who are masking themselves as farmers are doing great disservice to the nation. Those who take the life of an innocent man, rape women and insult the tricolour and justify the killings of citizens as reaction to the action cannot be termed as farmers," Bhatia said. The BJP leader also took pot-shots at Sonia's announce-

ment that she is a full-time and hands-on President, saying the Congress has once again moved on with its "all lies and create confusion politics" by brushing aside party's long internal strife and the subsequent issues raised by G-23 group within it. "It is not CWC but PBWC 'Parivar Bachao working committee', he quipped. BJP's IT Cell in-charge Amit Malviya also blamed Tikait for the Singhu-border incident. He took to Twitter to say that the gory murder would not have occurred if Rakesh Tikait had "not justified the mob lynching in Lakhimpur".

# Covid anthem released to mark 100-cr vax doses milestone

While the anthem is aimed at dispelling the myths and shedding vaccine hesitancy, the Centre cautioned that it was too early to declare victory over the virus that has swept the world as well as India. Till Saturday evening, as many as "97.23 crore have been administered the first dose of Covid vaccine in the country",

said Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya at an event here held to release the anthem. So far, more than 101 crore Covid-19 vaccine doses have been provided to states and union territories so far while over 11.12 crore balance and unutilised vaccine doses are still available with the states and UTs. The vaccines administered suggest about 70 per cent of the population getting at least one dose and about 30 per cent of the population has got two doses, said the Minister. "We administered 2.5 crore doses one single day on September 17 and next week we



will reach the 100 crore mark," he said. "This has happened because of the effort put in by all". The minister said while it takes 5-10 years to test and develop vaccines, India has researched and developed an in-house vaccine, and to add to the complex manufacturing, the humongous logistics involving setting up cold chains, airport transfers, delivery to states, local storage and last-mile connectivity were set up in no time. Kher, who has composed and sung the anthem, said it is essential to dispel myths and rumours surrounding vaccines and promote its usage so as to

ensure all get the vaccine. "We will be better equipped to deal with (a new challenge) both in terms of infrastructure and medical science" but "we should not declare victory yet," Oil Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said adding that vaccination has now become a people's movement despite the negative narrative and falsehood spread by some in the country. India has recorded 15,981 Covid-19 cases in a day, taking the infection tally to 3,40,53,573 while 166 more fatalities pushed the death toll to 4,51,980, according to the Union Health Ministry's data on Saturday. The number of active Covid

cases has declined to 2,01,632, the lowest in 218 days. The national recovery rate was at 98.07 per cent, the data updated at 8 am showed. India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20-lakh mark on August 7, 2020, 30 lakh on August 23, 40 lakh on September 5 and 50 lakh on September 16. It went past 60 lakh on September 28, 70 lakh on October 11, crossed 80 lakh on October 29, 90 lakh on November 20 and surpassed the one-crore mark on December 19. India crossed the grim milestone of two crore on May 4 and three crore on June 23.



# Guj Govt to give ₹5K help to tribals for Ayodhya visit

## Offer for those visiting Ram Janmabhoomi

**Ahmedabad:** The BJP Government in Gujarat has decided to offer financial assistance of ₹5,000 per person from the State's tribal community for pilgrimage to Shri Ram Janmabhoomi in Ayodhya, Tourism and Pilgrimage Development Minister Purnesh Modi said.

Addressing a gathering in the Shabari Dham -- a pilgrim site in Gujarat's Dangs district associated with Lord Sri Ram -- on the occasion of Dussehra on Friday, Modi also said that henceforth the State-level 'Dussehra Mahotsav' will be organised every year at different places of pilgrimage associated with Lord Ram in Gujarat. He said the tribal pilgrims will be given financial assistance of ₹5,000 per person for pilgrimage to Shri Ram Janmabhoomi.

The State-level Dussehra Mahotsav programme at Shabari Dham featured various tribal dance forms of Gujarat. Modi also said the Gujarat Government is working to develop a tourism circuit between Saputara in the Dangs district and the 'Statue of Unity' at Kevadia in the Narmada district, connecting tribal areas of the eastern part of Gujarat.

Modi, who also holds the portfolio of the Roads and Buildings Department in the Bhupendra Patel Government, said the celebration of the Dussehra festival, especially in tribal areas, would highlight the cultural and historical heritage of such areas.

Notably, the assembly elections are due in Gujarat in December next year. Ram Janmabhoomi is believed to be the birthplace of Lord Ram in Ayodhya.

Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra trust, which was set up after the Supreme Court verdict in November 2019, is entrusted with the task of constructing a temple of Lord Ram in Ayodhya.

Speaking on the occasion on Friday, Valsad MP KC Patel said Narendra Modi government has ensured the construction of a Ram temple in Ayodhya and the Union and Uttar Pradesh Governments are working together for the development of that area. In a surprise move, which is seen as an effort by the ruling BJP to blunt anti-incumbency ahead of the Assembly elections, the entire cabinet in Gujarat was replaced with new faces in September with the resignation of the chief minister Vijay Rupani, who was replaced with Bhupendra Patel. **PTI**

## PM to offer prayer at Kedarnath on Nov 5

**Dehradun:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Kedarnath on November 5 to offer prayers and inaugurate Kedarpuri reconstruction projects worth ₹250 crore.

This will be his second visit to the State within a month. The prime minister had visited the All Indian Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) in Rishikesh on October 7 to inaugurate an oxygen plant there.

Confirming Modi's visit to Kedarnath next month, Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami said apart from offering prayers at the Himalayan temple, the Prime Minister is likely to inaugurate Kedarpuri reconstruction projects worth ₹250 crore, including the rebuilt Samadhi of Adi Guru Shankaracharya.

The Prime Minister is also likely to lay foundation stones of second phase of Kedarpuri reconstruction projects worth ₹150 crore, Dhami said.

Modi has visited Kedarnath several times since becoming prime minister in 2014. He could not come to Kedarnath last year due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

With the pandemic situation relatively under control now there was speculation about his visit to the temple.

The Prime Minister has been closely monitoring Kedarpuri reconstruction projects.

The portals of Kedarnath are scheduled to be closed for winter on November 6 on the occasion of Bhaiyya Dooj. **PTI**

# BJP only knows jeebh chalana, jeep chadhana, says Akhilesh

**Lucknow:** Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav on Saturday took potshots at the BJP over the Lakhimpur Kheri incident, saying the ruling party only knows 'jeebh chalana' (lip service) and 'jeep chadhana' (mowing down people).

His criticism of the BJP came days after eight people were killed in violence during a farmers' protest in Uttar Pradesh's Lakhimpur Kheri which left eight, including four farmers, dead.

BJP leader and Union Minister Ajay Mishra's son Ashish has been arrested in connection with the case after he was accused of mowing down farmers with his vehicle. The minister has defended his son, claiming he is "innocent".

"The truth is the BJP knows only two things -- 'jeebh chalana' (lip service) and 'jeep chadhana' (mowing down people). Crushing people and suppressing their voice is their (BJP) agenda," Yadav said while addressing party workers at the Samajwadi Party headquarters here.



Ashish and others have been named in the FIR filed in this connection and the latter was arrested last week.

Claiming the BJP Government's tenure was "full of failures", Yadav alleged that because of "wrong policies" of the ruling party, the state lagged behind with runaway inflation and high unemployment.

"The entire tenure of the BJP government was full of failures. Due to the wrong policies of the BJP government, Uttar Pradesh lagged behind and there was no control on inflation, unemployment. The law and order also got worse," said a party statement, quoting Yadav.

"The BJP government has not done any work in public interest. The BJP is a strange party which is making tall claims without doing anything. The double engine Government of the BJP has harassed every section of society and has not done anything itself but has been appearing in advertisements claiming the works of the Samajwadi Party government as its own," he said.

Speaking about the 2022 Assembly elections, he said it would decide the direction of national politics and would also be a testing time for democracy.

Cautioning the workers, the SP chief said, "We have to be careful of the possible conspiracies of the BJP. Since the BJP is very clever, this time there should be no mistake and SP workers and leaders need to mobilise themselves up to the booth level."

He said people's problems will end and the interest of farmers and youths protected only when the SP forms a Government in the State. **PTI**

# SP, BSP district chiefs among seven held for 17-yr-old girl's rape in UP

**Lalitpur (UP):** Seven people, including the district presidents of the Samajwadi Party and the Bahujan Samaj Party, have so far been arrested in connection with the rape of a 17-year-old girl here, police said on Saturday.

The Samajwadi Party (SP) said it has dissolved its Lalitpur district unit. Superintendent of Police Nikhil Pathak said the arrests were made following the girl's complaint that she was raped for five years in different parts of the city. She named 25 people in her complaint along with three unknown persons, Pathak said.

A case was registered at Sadar Kotwali police station on October 12 against 25 people -- including the victim's

father and her uncle -- and three unknown persons.

The official said a hotel in Mirzapur district was raided on Friday from where Tilak Yadav and Deepak Ahirvar, the SP and the BSP district chiefs of Lalitpur respectively, and an engineer named Mahendra Dubey were arrested. The three were produced before a local court, which sent them to a 14-day judicial custody.

Earlier, four people were arrested in connection with the case. In a statement issued in Lucknow, SP chief spokesperson Rajendra Chaudhary said the entire Lalitpur district unit of the party has been dissolved with immediate effect on the directions of party chief Akhilesh Yadav. **PTI**

Launching the "Know Your Postman" (KYP) mobile App on the occasion of National Mails Day at the Mumbai Press Club here, Postmaster General, India Post Mumbai Region Swati Pandey said: "The App is an in-house attempt of Mumbai Post region to be citizen friendly, citizen centric and also promote digitisation at the same time. This is completely for the benefit of all Mumbaikars. This is a revolutionary step. More than 86,000 addresses have been tapped so far."



App, which can be downloaded from <https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.kyp.ipmp>, provides citizens an option to add their address, if a particular address is not found. "There is a link through which citizens can click and share the details of their address to be added and India Post, Mumbai will update the address within 24 hours," she said.

According to Pandey, the KYP mobile App will help you in providing details of the Postman, his contact number, the post office he is attached to and its contact details including

the telephone number and its address. "There are 89 delivery post offices of Mumbai city with approximately 2000 postmen/women with mobile devices. Mumbai city delivers approximately 2 to 2.5 lakh mails everyday which includes speed post, registered posts, Aadhaar cards, passports," she said, adding that India Post's backbone has always been its delivery services.

"Currently, we are conducting several training programmes for postmen/women whose average age is 45 years which is very high. As many as 1,800 postmen are being trained in soft skills. They are trained on how to respond to the customers," she said.

"Know your Postman" is India Post, Mumbai Region's initiative towards Digitisation of the postal network that will facilitate the working population of Mumbai. The app will enable citizens to directly communicate with their beat postman and facilitate delivery as per their convenience," she said.

# 31 in fray for Oct 30 bypoll to 5 Assembly seats in Assam

**Guwahati:** Altogether 31 contestants are in the fray after withdrawal of nomination on Saturday for the upcoming by-election in five Assam Assembly constituencies on October 30, a State Election Department release said here.

Eight candidates withdrew their papers leaving 31 in the electoral contest for Gossaigaon, Bhabanipur, Tamulpur, Mariani and Thowra constituencies.

The candidates who withdrew their nomination include three from Tamulpur constituency and five from Gossaigaon, said the release. The contesting candidates for Gossaigaon seat are Jowel Tudu (INC), Jiron Basumatary (UPPL), Dhruba Kumar Brahma Narzary (BPF), Khairul Anam Khandakar (AIUDF), besides Uttam Kumar Talukdar, Kamal Roy, Osman Gani Sk and Abdul Hashem Akand (all Independents).

For Bhabanipur seat, the candidates in the fray are Phanidhar Talukdar (BJP), Sailendra Nath Das (INC), Jubbar Ali (AIUDF), Merijul

Haque (Road Map Party), Siben Das (Voters Party International), besides Shawkat Ali Ahmed, Khampha Khungur Goyary and Ariful Islam (all Independents).

The contestants in the Tamulpur constituency are Bhaskar Dahal (INC), Brajendra Nath Deka (Gana Suraksha Party), Jolen Daimary (UPPL), Raj Kumar Baro (VPI), besides Ganesh Kachary and Yaswanta Chauhan (both Independents). In Mariani seat the candidates are Rupiyoti Kurmi (BJP), Luhit Konwar (INC), Gopal Chandra Ghatuwar (Asom Sangrami Mancha) and Sanjib Gogoi (Independent).

In Thowra the contestants are Sushanta Borgohain (BJP), Monuranjan Konwar (INC), Krishna Gogoi (CPI), besides Dhaijya Konwar and Lohit Gowala (both Independents). # Nearly 9,000 mobile phones worth ₹7 crore looted from truck

**Mathura (UP):** Unidentified miscreants looted nearly 9,000 mobile phones worth ₹7 crore from a Bengaluru-bound truck and allegedly attacked the driver by beating him up and throwing him out of the vehicle, police here said on Saturday. The incident took place on October 5 in Madhya Pradesh's Sheopur district but a case was registered in Uttar Pradesh's Mathura.

Superintendent of Police (City) Martand Prakash Singh said, "In a complaint filed by Sachin Manav, manager of Oppo Mobile Company, it has been said that the driver of Farrukhabad district, Munish Yadav, left Greater Noida on October 5 morning for Bengaluru after loading mobile phones in the truck when two people boarded the vehicle as passengers from Gwalior bypass of Farah police station area."

As soon as the truck crossed the Babina toll in Jhansi, the miscreants allegedly beat up the driver and threw him out of the vehicle in Sheopur district of Madhya Pradesh and fled with the truck, police said.

The miscreants fled leaving the empty truck in Manpur police station area of Sheopur district, he said.

The complainant has alleged that he had approached the Madhya Pradesh Police to file a complaint in this regard, however, they refused to do so citing that it will be filed based on the starting point, which is Mathura. **PTI**

# Modi will open seven medical colleges in UP on Oct 25, says UP CM

**Siddharthnagar (UP):** Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Saturday said Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate seven new medical colleges in the State from Siddharthnagar district on October 25.

The Chief Minister, who was here to review the preparations for the PM's arrival in Siddharthnagar, said a chain of new medical colleges will be functioning in UP.

The newly constructed medical colleges in seven districts -- Siddharthnagar, Deoria, Mirzapur, Etah, Hardoi, Ghazipur and Bahraich -- will be inaugurated by the Prime Minister on October 25. The admission process will be done in these medical colleges from this academic session through NEET examination, he said. The Chief

Minister, who inspected the newly constructed medical college building and its premises here, also held a meeting with public representatives and officials on the preparations for the arrival of the PM.

Talking to media persons later, Adityanath said health services have improved in UP. "Three to five life supporting ambulances are available in every district of the state," he said.

These seven new medical colleges will not only help the people of nearby districts but also neighbouring Nepal, he said, adding that the medical college in Siddharthnagar will be named after Madhav Prasad Tripathi, who was an active member of Jana Sangh and the first state president of BJP. Tripathi was a resident of Bansi assembly constituency of the district. **PTI**



# ISIS claims Shia mosque bombing in Afghanistan

The Islamic State group claimed responsibility for a deadly suicide bombing on a Shia mosque in southern Afghanistan that killed 47 people and wounded scores more. Relatives laid the bodies of the victims to rest on Saturday and called on the Taliban to protect them.

ISIS said in a statement posted late on Friday on social media that two of the group's members shot and killed security guards manning the entrance of the Fatimiya mosque in Kandahar province.

One detonated his explosives at the entrance of the mosque and the other inside.

ISIS's news agency *Amaq* in a statement gave the names of the attackers as Anas al-Khurasani and Abu Ali al-Baluchi, both Afghan nationals.

The families of the victims Saturday dug their graves and carried the bodies to their final resting place. In total, 63 graves were dug, but the Taliban's chief for the provincial department of culture and information maintained the official death toll was 47.

"There are so many who have lost body parts, and among those in hospital in serious condition, I don't know how many more numbers will

be added to the death toll," said community elder Hajji Farhad.

Shiite leader Sayed Mohammed Agha called on the Taliban Government to take serious measures to protect the Shia minority, "because our enemies will harm our society by any means they can."

The attack came a week after a bombing claimed by the local Islamic State affiliate killed 46 people at a Shia mosque in northern Afghanistan, raising fears that ISIS — an enemy of both the Taliban and the West — is expanding its foothold in Afghanistan.

Friday's attack was the deadliest to strike Afghanistan since the dramatic US exit

from the country, which allowed the Taliban to seize control of the Afghan capital. It was also the first major attack by the group in the country's south.

ISIS carries out frequent attacks in its eastern stronghold, but recently has shown signs of expansion, with attacks in the north and Kabul.

The attacks have brought into question the Taliban's ability to counter the growing ISIS threat. The Taliban have pledged to restore peace and security after decades of war and have also given the US assurances that they will not allow the country to be used as a base for launching extremist attacks on other countries.

# America vows to pay relatives of Afghans killed in drone strike

The US Defense Department said on Friday that it is committed to offering condolence payments to relatives of the 10 people who were killed in an errant US drone strike in Kabul, Afghanistan, in August.

Pentagon spokesman John Kirby said in a statement that the Defense Department was also working with the State Department to help surviving family members relocate to the United States.

Kirby said the matter arose in a meeting Thursday between Dr. Colin Kahl, under secretary of defense for policy, and Dr. Steven Kwon, founder and president of the nonprofit group Nutrition & Education International.

"Dr. Kahl reiterated Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin's commitment to the families, including offering ex gratia condolence payments," Kirby said. He did not say how much money would be offered.

On August 29, a US Hellfire missile struck a car driven by Zemerai Ahmadi, who had just pulled into the driveway of the Ahmadi family compound. In all, 10 members of the family, including seven children, were killed in the strike.

Weeks later, Marine Gen. Frank McKenzie, head of U.S.

Central Command, called the strike a "tragic mistake" and said innocent civilians were indeed killed in the attack.

During the meeting Thursday, Kwon told Kahl that Ahmadi had worked with NEI for many years, "providing care and lifesaving assistance for people facing high mortality rates in Afghanistan," according to Kirby.

The U.S. military initially defended the strike, saying it had targeted an Islamic State group's "facilitator" and disrupted the militants' ability to carry out attacks during the chaotic final stage of the withdrawal of US and NATO troops from Afghanistan.

Discrepancies between the military's portrayal of the strike and findings on the ground quickly emerged. *The Associated Press* and other news organizations reported that the driver of the targeted vehicle was a longtime employee at a US humanitarian organisation. There were no signs of a large secondary blast, despite the Pentagon's assertion that the vehicle contained explosives.

The drone strike followed a devastating suicide bombing by an Islamic State offshoot that killed 169 Afghans and 13 US military personnel at one of the gates to the Kabul airport in late August.

# UN official: Taliban to announce secondary school for girls

A senior UN official said on Friday the Taliban told him they will announce "very soon" that all Afghan girls will be allowed to attend secondary schools.

UNICEF Deputy Executive Director Omar Abdi, who visited Kabul last week, told reporters at UN headquarters that five of Afghanistan's 34 provinces — Balkh, Jawzjan and Samangan in the northwest, Kunduz in the northeast and Urozgan in the southwest — are already allowing girls to attend secondary school.

He said the Taliban's education minister told him they are working on "a framework" to allow all girls to continue their schooling beyond the sixth grade, which should be published "between a month and two."

"As I speak to you today, millions of girls of secondary school age are missing out on education for the 27th consecutive day," Abdi said. "We are urging them not to wait. Any day that we wait — it's a day lost for those girls that are out of school."

During the Taliban's previous rule of Afghanistan from

1996-2001, they denied girls and women the right to education and barred them from working and public life. Since their August 15 takeover of Afghanistan as US and NATO forces were in the final stages of their chaotic withdrawal from the country after 20 years, the Taliban have come under increasing international pressure to ensure women's rights to education and work.

Abdi said that in every meeting he pressed the Taliban "to let girls resume their learning," calling it "critical for the girls themselves and for the country as a whole."

When the Taliban were ousted from power in 2001 by a US-led coalition for harboring Osama bin Laden who masterminded the 9/11 attacks on the United States, only one million Afghan children were in school at all levels, he said.

Over the past 20 years, that figure rose to almost 10 million children at all levels, including 4 million girls, Abdi said, and in the last decade the number of schools tripled from 6,000 to 18,000.

"Education gains of the past two decades must be strengthened and not rolled back," he said.

### NEPAL RECORDS MASSIVE DIP IN NEW COVID CASES

**Kathmandu:** Nepal reported 136 new COVID-19 cases in the past 24 hours, a record low in comparison to the last few months, taking the national tally to 804,652 cases, the health ministry said on Wednesday. There are 12,598 active Covid cases across the country. During the last 24 hours, 845 people recovered from the disease.

Erdogan had been in office for more than two years when Merkel came to power in 2005. Since then, they have built a relationship based on pragmatism that has weathered several crises.

# Scotland Yard probes Islamist terror link to British MP's fatal stabbing

PTI ■ LONDON

Scotland Yard on Saturday said the killing of Conservative MP David Amess is being treated as a terrorist attack and it was probing a potential Islamist terrorism link to the fatal stabbing, an incident that has shocked the country and prompted calls for a review of security measures for lawmakers engaged in constituency work.

Amess, 69 and a member of British Prime Minister Boris Johnson's ruling Conservative Party, died after being stabbed several times on Friday as he was meeting his constituents in at Belfairs Methodist Church in Leigh-on-Sea, Essex.

A 25-year-old British man, believed to be of Somali heritage, was arrested at the scene on suspicion of murder and remains in custody at a police station in Essex, south-east England. Prime Minister Boris Johnson and Opposition Labour leader Sir Keir Starmer laid flowers at the scene of the stabbing, together on Saturday morning.

"Senior National Coordinator for Counter Terrorism Policing, Deputy Assistant Commissioner Dean Haydon formally declared the incident as terrorism. The early investigation has revealed a potential motivation linked to Islamist extremism," the

Metropolitan Police said in a statement.

"A 25-year-old British man was arrested at the scene on suspicion of murder. He is currently in custody at a police station in Essex. As part of the investigation, officers are currently carrying out searches at

two addresses in the London area and these are ongoing," it said.

"It is believed that he acted alone, and we are not seeking anyone else in connection with the incident at this time. However, enquiries into the circumstances continue," it added.

# ASEAN downgrades Myanmar presence at summit

## Myanmar junta chief excluded

AP ■ KUALA LUMPUR

Southeast Asian Foreign Ministers have agreed to downgrade Myanmar's participation in an upcoming summit in their sharpest rebuke yet of its leaders following a February 1 military takeover.

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations will invite a non-political representative instead of Myanmar's military leader, Senior Gen. Min Aung Hlaing, the grouping's chair Brunei said on Saturday.

The decision was made at an emergency meeting late Friday after Myanmar refused to cooperate with the bloc's crisis envoy, Erywan Yusof, who is Brunei's Second Foreign Minister.

In a swift response, Myanmar's foreign ministry said it was "extremely disappointed and strongly objected" to the group's decision, which was made without a consensus.

"Linking the matter of Myanmar's representation at

the ASEAN summit with the visit of the special envoy would be counterproductive as it is merely putting pressure on Myanmar," the statement said.

It also claimed that the military junta's current government was in line with Myanmar's constitution.

The 10-member bloc has been under intense international pressure to do more to force member state Myanmar to free scores of political figures, including ousted civilian leader Aung San Suu Kyi, as

well as halt the violence that has left more than 1,100 civilians dead. ASEAN's envoy abruptly canceled a trip to Myanmar this week after he was told he would not be able to meet with Suu Kyi, and others as he wanted. Myanmar contended Erywan could not meet with people facing legal proceedings such as Suu Kyi and deposed President Win Myint, Brunei said in a statement.

Suu Kyi and other top civilian leaders were detained in the army takeover. She faces various charges that her supporters and independent analysts say are an attempt to legitimize the military action.

The statement from Brunei said the ASEAN ministers were concerned about the impact of the Myanmar crisis on regional security and about the "unity, credibility and centrality of ASEAN as a rules-based organization." The bloc's envoy must have access to all concerned parties, it said.

Members of the political opposition's National Unity Government, which views itself as a shadow government, have asked to attend the October 26-28 summit, it said.

# Russia's daily virus deaths top 1,000 for first time

AP ■ MOSCOW

Russia's daily death toll from Covid-19 has exceeded 1,000 for the first time as the country faces a sustained wave of rising infections.

The national coronavirus task force on Saturday reported 1,002 deaths in the previous day, up from 999 on Friday, along with 33,208 new confirmed Covid-19 cases, more than 1,000 higher than the day before.

Russian authorities have tried to speed up the pace of

vaccinations with lotteries, bonuses and other incentives, but widespread vaccine skepticism and conflicting signals from officials stymied the efforts. The Government said this week that about 43 million Russians, or about 29% of the country's nearly 146 million people, are fully vaccinated.

Despite the mounting toll, the Kremlin has ruled out a new nationwide lockdown like the one early on in the pandemic that badly hurt the economy, eroding President Vladimir Putin's popularity.

# NASA's asteroid hunter Lucy soars into sky with diamonds

NASA spacecraft named Lucy rocketed into the sky with diamonds Saturday morning on a 12-year quest to explore eight asteroids.

Seven of the mysterious space rocks are among swarms of asteroids sharing Jupiter's orbit, thought to be the pristine leftovers of planetary formation.

An Atlas V rocket blasted off before dawn, sending Lucy on a roundabout journey spanning nearly 4 billion miles (6.3 billion kilometers). Researchers grew emotional describing the successful launch — lead sci-

# Cars with lower running costs likely to gain higher traction among buyers: Report

**New Delhi:** With fuel prices going up by 35 per cent over the past 15 months thereby impacting overall vehicle running costs, cars that have higher fuel efficiency and lower maintenance costs are expected to gain higher traction among buyers in India, specially in the sub-Rs 10 lakh category, according to a report.

Considering the fact that 70 per cent of the passenger vehicles market in India is still accounted for by vehicles costing less than Rs 10 lakh, the development augurs well for market leader Maruti Suzuki India Ltd (MSIL), said the report by HSBC Global Research.



"Over the past 15 months, fuel prices have gone up 35 per cent, impacting overall vehicle running costs...Our channel interactions suggest that customers are increasingly becoming

considerate of the recent rise in fuel prices," it said.

Citing the example of Maruti Suzuki's Swift petrol, the report said for a compact passenger vehicle fuel now accounts for around 40 per cent of the vehicle's life-time cost compared with 30 per cent in mid-2020.

"In the current environment, we believe cars that have higher fuel efficiency and lower maintenance costs should gain relatively higher traction among buyers, especially in the less than Rs 10 lakh category, which is still 70 per cent of the market in India," it said.

Stating that MSIL continues to score well in that regard,

HSBC Global Research said, "In our analysis, both in absolute terms and relative to competition, MSIL remains the market leader in fuel efficiency and total cost of ownership (COO)."

MSIL's competitive positioning should remain compelling given the fact that it has around 65 per cent market share in the less-than-Rs 10 lakh price category, it added.

The report also pointed out that MSIL's fuel efficiency has improved by 15-30 per cent in the past 10 years, citing the examples of fuel efficiency of Swift/Swift Dzire, which was 18 km per litre (kmpl) nearly 10 years back to 23.3 kmpl. **PTI**

## Tatas plan to pilot synergy between airlines, post SPA

**New Delhi:** Conglomerate Tata Group plans to pilot synergy between all its airlines to compete in various market segments.

Post the SPA transaction, Tatas will have two full-service carriers — Vistara and Air India — along with two low-cost airlines — Air India Express and AirAsia India -- and a ground and cargo handling company, AISATS.

Accordingly, plans are afoot to run all these brands as independent entities under one vertical for sometime after the SPA. Nonetheless, the group intends to drive in major synergies between the airlines in terms of fleet management, route deployment, flight timings and airport slot planning.

In terms of USPs, Vistara is expected to retain the premium services tag, while Air India will predominantly focus on key international and metro routes. The domestic feeder traffic is expected to be driven by AirAsia India which may get few aircraft from Air India's fleet. Furthermore, mergers will depend on profitability, performance and market situation apart from each airline's unique culture and suitability of brand. **IANS**

## UP's Purvanchal emerging as hub of vegetable export

**Lucknow:** The Purvanchal region of Uttar Pradesh is emerging as the export hub for vegetables.

Despite the Covid-19 pandemic, huge consignments of fresh green vegetables were flown from Purvanchal to the Gulf countries, for the second time in less than two years, benefitting farmers substantially in terms of income.

According to a state government spokesperson, an Air India Express' aircraft carrying two metric tonnes of vegetables from Prayagraj, Bhadohi and Varanasi took off from Lal Bahadur Shastri International Airport to reach Dubai and Sharjah in the United Arab Emirates (UAE).

Regional in-charge of the Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA), C.B. Singh, said: "The vegetables being exported include okra, sweet gourd, pointed gourd, ivy gourd and elephant foot yam (jimikand)."

"Last year, three metric tonnes of langda mangoes were flown to London from Varanasi in April and over one metric

tonnes in June. We also exported nearly three metric tonnes of green chili to Dubai in May and black salt rice to the UK, Qatar and the UAE."

Furthermore, exporters also purchased 80 metric tonnes of black salt rice from farmers of Chandauli district, popularly known as the 'rice bowl' of Uttar Pradesh, with the help of APEDA in June 2020.

Around Rs 68 lakhs raised from the export of the rice was directly transferred to the bank accounts of 152 farmers.

Besides, 532 metric tonnes of regional rice, including 12 metric tonnes of the famous black salt rice of Chandauli was exported to Qatar in December 2020.

Oman's Global Logistics Group also visited Varanasi in order to boost exports.

Farmers are now exporting food items directly without the involvement of middlemen which is bringing them more financial benefits while ensuring transparency in the system. They are exporting their farm produce through the Farmer Producer Organization (FPO). **IANS**

## HDFC Bank's Q2FY22 YoY net profit up 17.6%

**Mumbai:** Lender HDFC Bank on Saturday reported a year-on-year rise of 17.6 per cent in its net profit for Q2FY22.

The bank's net profit increased to Rs 8,834.3 crore during the period under review over the quarter ended September 30, 2020.

Besides, the bank's net interest income (income earned less interest expended) rose 12.1 per cent from Rs 15,776.4 crore to Rs 17,684.4 crore for the corresponding quarter of the previous fiscal.

The lender's net revenues (net interest income plus other income) increased by 14.7 per cent, from Rs 21,868.8 crore to Rs 25,085.2 crore for the quarter ended September 30, 2020.

"Advances grew at 15.5 per cent reaching new heights driven through relationship management, digital offering and breadth of products. Core net interest margin was at 4.1 per cent. New liability relationships added during the quarter were at an all time high," HDFC Bank said in a statement. **IANS**

## India's forex reserves rise by over \$2 bn

**Mumbai:** India's foreign exchange reserves rose by \$2.039 billion during the week ended October 8.

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) forex reserves rose to \$639.516 billion from \$637.477 billion reported for the week ended October 1.

India's forex reserves comprise foreign currency assets (FCAs), gold reserves, SDRs, and the country's reserve position with the IMF.

On a weekly basis, FCAs, the largest component of the forex reserves, edged higher by \$1.550 billion to \$577.001 billion. Similarly, the value of the country's gold reserves rose by \$464 million to \$38.022 billion.

However, SDR value fell by \$28 million to \$19.268 billion. The country's reserve position with the IMF also fell by \$3 million to \$5.225 billion. **IANS**

## IMF hails India's 'swift and substantial' response to Covid crisis

**Washington:** Describing the Indian government's response to the Covid-19 situation as "swift and substantial", the International Monetary Fund (IMF) has said the country continued with labour reforms and privatisation despite the pandemic.

The IMF in its report based on "consultations" among members, however, sounded a note of caution saying that the economic outlook remains "clouded" due to pandemic-related uncertainties, contributing to both downside and upside risks.

In its "Article IV" consultations report, it further said that a persistent negative impact of COVID-19 on investment and other growth drivers could prolong the economic recovery.

On the Indian government's handling of the pandemic, the multilateral agency

said it was "swift and substantial...Has included fiscal support, including scaled-up support to vulnerable groups, monetary policy easing, liquidity provision, and accommodative financial sector and regulatory policies".

"Despite the pandemic, the authorities have continued to introduce structural reforms, including labour reforms and a privatisation plan," the report said. The IMF has projected India's economic growth at 9.5 per cent in FY2021-22 and 8.5 per cent in 2022-23. Headline inflation is projected at 5.6 per cent in 2021-22, amid elevated price pressures.

"The economic outlook remains clouded due to pandemic-related uncertainties contributing to both downside and upside risks. A persistent negative impact of COVID-19 on investment, human capital, and other growth drivers could

prolong the recovery and impact medium-term growth," the IMF said.

It further said that while India benefits from favourable demographics, disruption to access to education and training due to the pandemic could weigh on improvements in human capital.

At the same time, the recovery could also be faster than expected, it said adding that faster vaccination and better therapeutics could help contain the spread and limit the impact of the pandemic.

In addition, successful implementation of the announced wide-ranging structural reforms could increase India's growth potential, the IMF noted.

Under Article IV of the IMF's Articles of Agreement, the IMF holds bilateral discussions with members, usually every year. **PTI**

## Cement demand recovery continues post second wave: Report

**New Delhi:** Cement prices are expected to rise during H2FY22, as cost inflation firms up unabatedly, said a report by HDFC Securities.

Cement demand has picked up from June 2021 onwards, as the Covid impact started to recede.

According to the report, cement demand is recovering well and has supported limited price correction during the monsoon period.

"We expect cement prices to rise during H2FY22, as cost inflation is firming up unabated and has impacted the whole industry. Good demand and increased consolidation should support the industry's cost pass through ability," the report said. **IANS**

As per the report, rising fuel and diesel prices will further inflate the operating costs of the producers.

"While pet coke prices have surged another 20 per cent QoQ (double YoY), imported thermal coal prices have also spiked up by 33 per cent QoQ. Rising crude prices have pushed up diesel prices by 7 per cent QoQ. Thus, we have built in Rs 80-100 per MT input cost inflation and RS 20-40 per MT freight cost increase QoQ for our coverage universe," it said.

The brokerage house expects aggregate revenue from its coverage universe to rise 14 per cent YoY on higher volumes in 2QFY22E. **IANS**

## SCO meet: India calls for special working group on start-ups

**New Delhi:** India has proposed creation of a new Special Working Group on Start-ups and Innovation at the SCO.

The proposal was made by Minister of State for Commerce and Industry Anupriya Patel, in her intervention, at the 20th meeting of the SCO Ministers.

Stressing on the need for effective cooperation between the member states for a balanced and equitable growth in trade and commerce, Patel proposed the creation of a new Special Working Group on Start-ups and Innovation and for setting up a new Expert Working Group on Cooperation in Traditional Medicine.


"She also stated that cooperation in the field of start-ups and innovation can be a focal point in reviving our economies from the consequences of the pandemic," the Ministry of Commerce & Industry said in a statement.

She highlighted that there is "a significant gap in digital technologies between developed and developing countries which needs to be narrowed down by building digital capacities".

On the environment issues, the minister welcomed the need for environment protection and mitigation of adverse effects of climate change.

She also stressed that the climate agenda should not introduce measures which becomes unnecessary barriers to trade.

In her concluding remarks, Patel emphasised that SCO members must prepare, act and stand in solidarity with each other and pursue an agenda that is equitable and inclusive and development oriented. **IANS**

## Turkish lira hits record low after central bank policymakers sacked

**Ankara:** The Turkish lira has hit a new record low against the US dollar after President Recep Tayyip Erdogan dismissed three central bank members.

The lira dropped nearly 1.2 per cent to 9.18 against \$1 on Thursday after the currency had already weakened as much as 19 per cent this year, reports Xinhua news agency.

Erdogan removed two deputy governors, Semih Tumen and Ugur Namik Kucuk, along with the member of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) Abdullah Yavas, according to a decision published in the official gazette on early Thursday.

He appointed two new members, Taha Cakmak as a deputy governor, and Yusuf Tuna as an Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) member.

Erdogan has fired three central bank governors in the last two and a half years over policy disagreements.

Last month, the central bank cut its policy rate to 18 per cent from 19 per cent.

Local media reported that deputy governor Kucuk had opposed the decision to cut the main interest rate. **IANS**

## Court order to affect working capital of companies filing GST appeals

**New Delhi:** In what may affect the working capital of taxpayers looking at filing appeals against GST claims, it had now been held that anyone seeking remedy against indirect tax decision would have to make pre-deposit amount in cash and not by debiting electronic credit ledger.

Recently, the Division Bench of the Orissa High Court held that pre-deposit at the time of filing an appeal under section 107(6) of the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 (CGST Act) cannot be made by debiting the Electronic Credit Ledger (ECLR). The payment of pre-deposit should be made by debiting the Electronic Cash Ledger (ECL) in accordance with section 49(3) of the CGST Act read with Rule 85(4) of the Central Goods and Services Tax Rules, 2017 (CGST Rules).

What this order in effect does is that it puts the burden on taxpayers to pay the pre-deposit (ie 10 per cent of disputed tax) amount in cash by transferring money from electronic cash ledger (ECL) for any tax dispute raised by them. This would mean more cash outflows leaving little for working capital needs.

In case that went to the Orissa High Court, the revenue raised demands of GST along

with interest on the petitioners, who were engaged in execution of works contract. The petitioner filed an appeal and made payment towards pre-deposit (i.e. 10 per cent of disputed tax) for filing an appeal, by utilising the balance in the ECLR. The revenue dismissed the appeal and considered it to be defective, emphasising that the liability of pre- deposit can be discharged only by debiting ECL.

The petitioner's contention was that any payment towards output tax can be made through ECLR. Since pre-deposit can be construed as a percentage of output tax, it can be paid by debiting ECLR.

Revenue department contended that the CGST Act specifically provides that ECLR can be utilised towards payment of output tax. However, pre-deposit required to be made cannot be equated with output tax payable. Input tax credit can be utilised only to discharge 'self-assessed output tax as per the return'.

The High Court's accepted this contention and observed that the pre-deposit cannot be equated with 'output tax' and that the restriction under proviso to section 41(2) of the CGST Act, limits the usage of the credit ledger for making pre-deposit. **IANS**





# THE DEATH STING

At present, Delhi is witnessing a rise in Dengue patients, reporting the maximum number of cases since 2018 due to prolonged monsoon. SUPRIYA RAMESH talks to experts to know more

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), Dengue cases have grown dramatically around the world in recent decades. A vast majority of cases are asymptomatic or mild and self-managed, and hence the actual numbers of Dengue cases are under-reported. Many cases are also misdiagnosed as other febrile illnesses.

With the advent of the rainy season, we surely get some respite from the scorching summer heat but many water-borne diseases tag along. And one of the most common diseases is Dengue, a mosquito-borne viral infection that is common in warm, tropical climates. It is caused by any one of four closely related antigenically distinct groups called serotypes that are DENV-1, DENV-2, DENV-3 and DENV-4, which means that it is possible to be infected four times in a lifetime. A particular serotype can be predominant at different times in a geographical area. It gives space to a wide number of symptoms that can be extremely mild (unnoticeable) to extremely severe. In severe cases, it can also be fatal.

Currently, Delhi is witnessing a surge in cases, reporting the maximum number of cases since 2018 for the same period due to prolonged monsoon. Whereas Punjab which observed 8,400 cases last year has reported only 5,889 cases this year, Hoshiarpur topping the list with 933 cases.

While many Dengue infections cause only mild illness, there have been cases where it has also caused an acute flu-like illness. Over time, this forms into a potentially lethal complication, called severe Dengue. WHO states that severe Dengue is a leading cause of serious illness and death in some Asian and Latin American countries and requires management by medical professionals.

As per a comparative study published in Clinical Infectious Diseases, the incidence of Dengue has grown dramatically around the world in recent decades. A vast majority of cases are asymptomatic or mild and self-managed, and hence the actual numbers of Dengue cases are under-reported. Many cases are also misdiagnosed as other febrile illnesses.

The number of Dengue cases reported to WHO increased eight times over the last two decades, from 505,430 cases in 2000 to over 2.4 million in 2010, and 5.2 million in 2019. Reported deaths between the years 2000 and 2015 increased from 960 to 4032.

But why are we talking about DENV-2 at the moment? Is it more severe than all other serotypes? How worried should we be? These are the questions our mind is flooded with and it is high time we all should understand the seriousness of the disease and keep an ear to the ground.

The DENV-2 or D2 variant of

Dengue was struck many cases of fever and deaths in western UP districts of Firozabad, Agra, Mathura and Aligarh. The term severe Dengue is in circulation now. It was earlier known as Dengue haemorrhagic fever and Dengue shock syndrome.

The new variant has been observed in 11 states and has become a topic of discussion amongst medical experts and organisations. “With DENV-2 type there seems to be a higher incidence of Dengue hemorrhagic fever where there is a capillary leak and bleed with low platelets and it may eventually progress to Dengue shock syndrome where blood pressure drops,” Dr Dilip Gude, Sr Consultant Physician, Yashoda Hospitals Hyderabad tells you.

“A person previously infected with Dengue when gets infected with a different serotype has a higher chance of developing hemorrhagic fever or shock syndrome,” tells Dr Anurag Aggarwal, Consultant Internal Medicine, QRG Super Speciality Hospital.

With all the talk about mosquitoes increasing during the rainy season, it is equally important to know that mosquitoes are also mainly attracted to carbon dioxide and heat, which indicates that they are equally active during summer. Moreover, DENV has the potential to infect people all year round and with this, the risk and fear remain throughout. Dr Anurag tells you more about the factors responsible for mosquito-spread. “Lack of adequate drainage, open drains and open areas of water stagnation are factors responsible for rapid spread. Increased movement of people without the adequate coverage of the body with exposed arms and legs increases their risk of getting bitten by an infected mosquito, wherein one in four people infected with Dengue virus will develop the disease.”

Talking about the symptoms, they can develop four to 10 days after the mosquito bites and last anywhere from two to seven days. We might be aware of only the common, usually talked about symptoms like high fever, severe body pain and internal bleeding with falling platelets but Dr Aggarwal gives a detailed note on the same. “High-grade fever with chills, backache, abdominal pain, rash, vomiting, joint pains, muscle aches, generalised weakness and fatigue and in severe cases shock, hemorrhagic manifestation like vomiting out blood, bleeding from anus, nose, gums and blood in the urine.”

He further adds that when a patient is having severe abdominal pain, recurrent vomiting and increased irritability, it may indicate the patient is developing severe Dengue. The intensity of fever has no correlation with the severity of illness a patient develops in the following days of illness.

In case one is facing possible symptoms and is sceptical about the testing, all

you need to know is that there are two ways to get yourself tested, a card test and ELISA. Dr Aggarwal elaborates, “Testing is done by blood. One is through the card test which is not as sensitive as another test called ELISA. Two types of antigens are of significance, NS1 which is usually detectable within 24 hrs of symptom onset and may remain positive until nine days and other is IgM which is usually detectable four to five days after symptom onset and remains positive up to 12 weeks after catching an infection or maybe even longer.”

More than 20,000 confirmed Dengue cases across the country have been reported with more than 220 deaths occurring only in Uttar Pradesh. Cases have been reported from Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, MP, Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, and Telangana.

There are no vaccines and currently, the treatment of Dengue is through supportive care and no specific medication is available. “The management includes intravenous fluid therapy, monitoring of the clinical condition, and intensive care. This helps reduce the morbidity and mortality in Dengue fever complications. Mild and uncomplicated cases can be managed at home under the supervision of the doctor,” Dr Anjali Saxena, Senior Consultant, General Pediatrics tells you.

Moreover, WHO has advised that patients should seek medical advice, rest and drink plenty of fluids. Paracetamol can be taken to bring down fever and reduce joint pains. However, aspirin or ibuprofen should not be taken since they can increase the risk of bleeding.

We can say that the Dengue outbreak is still under control but it has led to a surge in cases of high fever countrywide. As it is known to cause more morbidity than other variants, patients are having high-grade fever. Dr Gude tells you that

- Diseases that are spread to people by mosquitoes include Zika virus, West Nile virus, Chikungunya virus, yellow fever and malaria.
- Zika fever, also known as Zika virus disease or simply Zika, is a mosquito-borne disease caused by the Zika virus. In many cases, there are no symptoms, but it can present in a similar way to dengue fever.
- Yellow fever is a viral disease of typically short duration. However, approximately 30,000 people around the world die from yellow fever every year.
- Chikungunya is a viral disease transmitted to humans via infected mosquitoes. Symptoms typically include fever, joint pain, headache, muscle pain, joint swelling and rash.

there is an epidemiological hypothesis that there is a four-year cyclical spurt for Dengue outbreaks and DENV-2 serotype now is known to cause a much-complicated disease.

With this, he advises that early diagnosis, aggressive hydration, and admitting high-risk groups such as the elderly and children and immunosuppressed patients may be important.

Considering the pandemic, how worried should we be about the Dengue virus? Are there chances that it could worsen amidst the pandemic? These are again a few questions that might cross our minds. Early symptoms of both COVID and Dengue can be the same and it would be nearly impossible for a common man to self detect if he/she has been infected

by corona or Dengue. And coinfections are common and if someone gets COVID and Dengue then the outcome is going to be deadly.

“In this pandemic background, one needs to be extra careful and take all necessary precautions to prevent mosquito-borne diseases,” Dr Gude tells you.

Dr Saxena tells you that during these times healthcare resources can get overwhelmed and this can be detrimental to providing medical care to the needy.

Your safety is in your hands and making sure that you are not giving a breeding ground to mosquitoes is your responsibility. Keep the surroundings of your house as dry as possible with no scope for stagnant water, cover your body with full sleeves clothes, put on mosquito repellent creams, coils, nets. Dr Gude suggests that having a high index of suspicion and taking a clinician’s help as early as possible is important.

“Do not allow water to stagnate, cover drains or sprinkle oil over stagnated water, empty pots/tyres of water in your house, wear full sleeves clothes when stepping outside the house,” Dr Aggarwal tells you.

He further adds that in case of fever, visit your nearest physician as soon as possible. Watch for symptoms like intense abdominal pain, bleeding from any site, restlessness and breathlessness when you need to be concerned.

“The proximity of mosquito vector breeding sites to human habitation is a significant risk factor for Dengue as well as for other diseases that Aedes mosquito transmit. At present, the main method to control or prevent the transmission of Dengue virus is to combat the mosquito vectors,” WHO advises and suggest ways through which it can be achieved.

- ◆ **Prevention of mosquito breeding**  
Preventing mosquitoes from accessing egg-laying habitats by environmental management and modification
- Applying appropriate insecticides to water storage outdoor containers
- ◆ **Personal protection from mosquito bites**  
Using of personal household protection measures, such as window screens, repellents, insecticide-treated materials, coils and vaporizer and wearing clothing that minimises skin exposure
- ◆ **Community engagement**  
Educating the community on the risks of mosquito-borne diseases
- ◆ **Reactive vector control**  
Emergency vector control measures such as applying insecticides as space spraying during outbreaks may be used by health authorities

In addition, there is ongoing research amongst many groups of international collaborators in search of novel tools and innovative strategies that will contribute to global efforts to interrupt the transmission of Dengue, as well as other mosquito-borne diseases.

## MYTH BUSTER

### You cannot get dengue fever twice

The dengue virus (DENV) known to cause dengue fever has four different but related serotypes, DENV-1, DENV-2, DENV-3 AND DENV4. When a person recovers from their first infection, they gain lifetime immunity from this single serotype only. Contracting the disease from the other three dengue types is still possible, with each subsequent infection potentially more severe than its predecessor.

### Dengue is contagious

Dengue is transmitted to humans when an infected female mosquito bites, mainly the Aedes aegypti mosquito. A person cannot contract the virus through an infected person if he or she sneezes or coughs. Moreover, cases of DENV transmission through blood transfusion or organ transplantation are also rare.

### An infected mosquito breeds only in dirty stagnant water

An Aedes aegypti mosquito may not necessarily lay eggs only in dirty water, it can do it in clean stagnant water too. It is important to drain or to keep the containers and surfaces around the house like basins, pots, jars and rain gutters firmly closed with a lid at all times.

### Dengue fever is only prevalent during the rainy season

The sole reason why people believe this myth that dengue fever is more during the rainy season is because the Aedes aegypti lay eggs in water so it is natural to relate to it. Mosquitoes are also attracted to carbon dioxide and heat, which suggests that they are just as active during summer.

### Your body may heal itself naturally from dengue fever

A person might suffer from dengue fever for a week with severe headaches, vomiting, and bone and muscle pain. People might have the ability to recover without getting hospitalised but they cannot recover without proper rest, hydration and painkillers. The disease might evolve into severe dengue if self-managed.

## India win SAAF Championship for 8th time

Three teams are tied for third at the end of the second day with Team Jessica Korda, Team Strom and Team Popov all on 29-under-par.

## CSK coach Fleming joins NZ camp ahead of World Cup

New Zealand will begin their T20 World Cup cam-

paign against Pakistan in the Super 12 stage at the Sharjah Cricket Stadium on October 26.

New Zealand will play India three days later at the Dubai International Stadium.

Besides Afghanistan, there will be two qualifiers from Round 1 in Group 2 of the Super 12 stage.

Australia, England, South Africa and the West Indies along with two qualifiers will form Group 1 in Super 12s.

The T20 World Cup will start in the UAE and Oman on Sunday with the final scheduled to be held here on on November 14.

## Bahrain GP kicks off 23-race F1 season in 2022

AP ■ PARIS

Next year’s Formula One season will feature 23 races and open in Bahrain rather than its traditional start in Australia, with Singapore and Canada returning after two straight cancellations amid the coronavirus pandemic.

The 2022 calendar was approved by governing body FIA’s World Motor Sport Council on Friday.

The Bahrain Grand Prix in Sakhir on March 20 will be followed by the second hosting of the Saudi Arabia GP in Jeddah and then the Australian GP in Melbourne on April 10.

The season then jumps to Europe two weeks later for the Emilia Romagna GP in Italy (subject to contract approval) and then to the United States for the Miami GP on May 8 (subject to circuit approval



by the FIA).

“We prepare to enter a new era with brand new regulations and cars for next year that are designed to create closer racing,” F1 president Stefano Domenicali said.

The Spanish GP on May 22 (also subject to contract approval) is followed by the showcase Monaco race one week later before F1 goes to Baku in Azerbaijan on June 12.

## Young Saurashtra player Avi Barot expires

Saurashtra batter Avi Barot, a former India Under-19 captain and a member of the Ranji Trophy winning team in the 2019-20 season, has died after suffering a cardiac arrest at a shockingly young age of 29.

The player, who also represented Haryana and Gujarat in his career, died on Friday while being taken to a hospital after he felt unwell at his home in Ahmedabad. He is survived by his mother and wife, who is expecting the couple’s first child.

“Avi was at home when he felt unwell. He was being rushed to the hospital and breathed his last inside the ambulance. He was a very lively boy and seeing his talent, I brought him to Saurashtra from Haryana where he started his first class career,” Saurashtra Cricket Association (SCA) President Jaydev Shah told PTI.

“Avi’s father passed away at 42. He is now survived by his mother and wife who is four months pregnant. It will take a lot of time for me to accept this tragedy,” Shah said. The young cricketer was competing only last week in a local tournament.

He was a right-handed batter, who could also bowl off-breaks.

“I am still in a state of shock. He was just 29 and last week we

had a state-level tournament Jeevan Trophy where he came and played. I infact told him you are scoring runs, you can take it easy but he said ‘Jaydev bhai we need to win it,’” Shah recalled.

Barot played 38 first-class matches, 38 List A matches and 20 Domestic T20 games. He was a wicket-keeper-batsman and scored 1,547 runs in first-class matches, 1030 runs in list-A games and 717 runs in T20s.

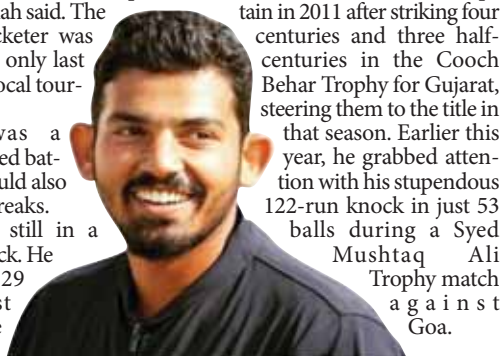
“Extremely shocked and saddened to learn of the untimely demise of Avi Barot. A bright young cricketer, who represented India U19, Saurashtra and Haryana has left us all too early. Condolences to his family and friends in this hour of grief,” stated BCCI Secretary Jay Shah.

Barot was a part of the Ranji Trophy winning Saurashtra team, which had defeated Bengal in the summit clash. He had scored a half century in that match.

For Saurashtra, he played 21 Ranji Trophy matches, 17 List A matches and 11 domestic T20 games.

Barot was India U-19 captain in 2011 after striking four centuries and three half-centuries in the Cooch Behar Trophy for Gujarat, steering them to the title in that season. Earlier this year, he grabbed attention with his stupendous 122-run knock in just 53 balls during a Syed

Mushtaq Ali Trophy match against Goa.



## Pedri signs new deal with ‘greatest club’ Barcelona

AP ■ BARCELONA

Barcelona midfielder Pedri González signed a new contract through 2026, with the club hoping the teenager can help it recover from the traumatic departure of Lionel Messi.

Pedri has been one of the very few bright spots for Barcelona over the past year, during which a president has resigned and its debt has skyrocketed. Barcelona had to let Messi walk away when it could not pay his wages. Painful losses on the field have followed.

“My desire was to remain here for many years,” the 18-year-old Pedri said after signing.

“It is true that we are going through a difficult moment, but we are the greatest club in the world and we are going to work this out.”

Pedri is coming off a breakout season, his first with Barcelona after joining from Las Palmas. The playmaker led Barcelona with 53 appearances, helping it win the Copa del Rey. Pedri also became a key player for Spain, helping the national team reach the semifinals of the European Championship and winning a silver medal at the Tokyo Olympics.

His salary was not made public but



Barcelona president Joan Laporta thanked Pedri for making “an effort” to reach an agreement that the cash-strapped club could afford.

An exultant Laporta, who at one point in their joint news conference accidentally called Pedri “Messi,” said re-signing the teenager was “of those days when it pays to be Barça’s president.”

In a sign of the expectations Barcelona has placed on Pedri, his contract includes a release clause of 1 billion euros (\$1.1 billion), the highest in club history. Barcelona

director of football Mateu

Alemany said Pedri’s release clause “means he will be off the market for several years.”

Pedri signed for Barcelona in 2019 from Las Palmas, a second-division club on his native Canary Islands. The transfer fee of 5 million euros (\$5.8 million) proved a steal. At Barcelona, Pedri quickly convinced coach Ronald Koeman that he should be his central playmaker in a similar role to former great Andrés Iniesta.

## Northern European countries oppose biennial World Cup plan

AP ■ GENEVA

The six-nation Nordic group of European soccer federations have detailed their opposition to FIFA’s push to stage the World Cup every two years.

Increasing the number of World Cups would “cannibalize” existing competitions, make European Championships “obsolete” and marginalize women’s tournaments, the federations wrote in a co-signed statement.

“It (the FIFA proposal) can fundamentally make it impossible to continue with our current model of national tournaments and national team matches,” said the statement, which was released after a meeting in Copenhagen, Denmark.

The Nordic opposition wasn’t unexpected with influential officials from the region working at European governing body UEFA, which has called for “proper consultation” before a decision is made. Karl-Erik



Nilsson of Sweden is UEFA’s first vice president and Danish soccer president Jesper Møller is a UEFA executive committee member.

Still, most of the Nordics meet FIFA’s target market of national teams which typically are not at the World Cup and might vote to get twice as many chances to qualify.

Finland and the Faeroe

Islands have never qualified, Iceland’s appearance in 2018 was its first and Norway has not played at the World Cup since 1998.

On Tuesday, Denmark became the second European nation to advance to the 2022 tournament in Qatar. Sweden leads its qualifying group ahead of Spain.

The Nordic group also said

FIFA should not try to rush through such radical changes.

Outside Europe, the biennial plan has been publicly supported by soccer bodies most loyal to FIFA president Gianni Infantino — in Africa and with Asian soccer federations allied with Saudi Arabia.

FIFA, which already expanded the World Cup to 48 teams starting in 2026, says biennial tournaments will raise money and fuel soccer development, help close the gap on European and South American dominance, and give players and fans more meaningful games to watch.

“The Nordic football associations will work with constructive amendments to make football prosper further in other regions, but this should not be at the cost of successful developments in Europe,” the six nations said. FIFA has said it is still consulting soccer organizations but it could make a decision in December when its 211 members meet.

# EATING OUT RIGHT

Weight loss is a journey that must be traversed with patience, over time. This festive season, when you are most likely to eat out, keeping a few things in mind while selecting the dishes should do the trick, writes author **KAVITA DEVGAN** in her new book *The Don't-Diet Plan*, An edited excerpt:

Eating out is a part of life, be it for leisure or due to travel. However, the more frequently you eat out, the more calories you ingest, getting heavier in the bargain. You don't need me to tell you that, you know it already. Besides, every time you eat out, you ruin your happiness guessing, wishing you knew everything you were wolfing down-fat, calories, sodium, etc. and wondering if you had made a wrong choice and sabotaged your heart's health yet again. Faced with an extensive tempting menu, it's easy to get carried away and forget all about healthy eating, but making healthier choices need not be a nightmare. Let me show you how.

GET CUISINE WISE

Here is a brief 'eating out manual' to help you navigate these four very popular cuisines when you go out to enjoy them the next time.

Italian

Here the basics are trim and healthy but the offenders to look out for are surplus oil, cream and butter (which are poured freely into most dishes). Are you wondering what to pick then? Learn to differentiate between Northern and Southern Italian cuisines. Southern Italy traditionally follows a Mediterranean diet, which is rich in grains, fruits and vegetables, contains very little meat and uses olive oil in place of butter. Northern Italian cuisine, on the other hand, is heavy on the beef, butter and cream. Start with plain Italian bread rather than buttered garlic bread. Be careful of fresh Italian bread soaked with deliciously flavoured olive oil too. Salads can be a good starter and filler but make sure that you ask for the dressing and vinegar on the side. An all-vegetable antipasto, insalata-green salad, Panzanella, a tomato and mozzarella salad and fish in cartoccio are some good options. Do you want to eat pasta? Then skip cheese-filled ones in favour of those with red clam sauce or meat sauce. Classic pasta with marinara sauce is a lean choice. And if you want to have a heavier entrée like lasagne, then have only half of it. At the end of the meal, skip the dessert, resist the cannoli or cream-filled pastry and have a decaf cappuccino, made with low fat milk or have fresh fruit.

Mexican

In Mexican cuisine, the common offenders to look out for are enchiladas (tortillas fried in oil) and tacos (deep-fried tortillas), chimichangas, chilli rellenos, tostadas and flautas-all of them are deep fried. Cheese and sour cream toppings add extra fat and calories, so

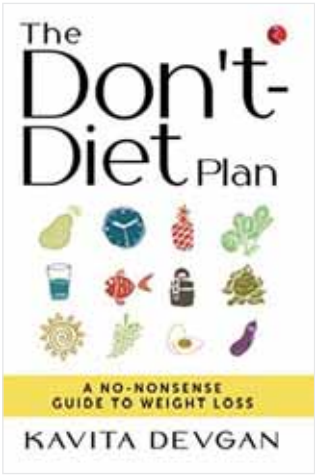
do the side-dishes like chips and nachos. Are you wondering what to pick then? Take your cue from the names of the menu items. Foods that are prepared 'asada' are grilled, which is a non-fat cooking process. 'Fajitas' are made up of grilled meat or chicken. Use salsa on your main course instead of sour cream and cheese, as 'salsa' made with tomato, onion, chillies and herbs is virtually fat-free and bursting with vitamins A and C. Be extremely careful of the portion size. Choose the dessert carefully-a fruit plate of mangoes, guavas and papaya tastes as good and is far less calorie-dense than sopapillas (deep-fried sweet pastries) or fried ice cream.

Greek

Greek food is super healthy and comprises of grains, fruits and vegetables, olive oil and very little meat. Sauces are based on wine, stocks, tomato and yoghurt, rather than milk or cream. Lentils, beans and vegetables are commonly used in soups, appetizers and main courses. So far so good, but still, you can't be careful enough. Are you wondering what to pick? The signature of a Greek salad, the 'Greek' olives and feta cheese, are very high in sodium, so go easy. You can even ask to have the feta rinsed before it is served to limit your sodium intake. Be wary of taramasalata, a delicious, though calorie-rich, cream-based dip. Instead, have pita bread spread with a yoghurt-based dip like tzatziki, made with yoghurt, garlic and cucumber. Breadsticks dipped in hummus (sesame paste and chickpeas) or baba ghanoush (eggplant and olive oil) are other good options. For soup, skip the better-known avgolemono soup, which has a lemon and egg base and go for torato, chilled eggplant, peppers and yoghurt soup as this has more fibre and less cholesterol. If you're watching your fat and cholesterol numbers, then pass up moussaka and pastitsio casseroles made from eggs and cheese, and opt for grilled or broiled meat, poultry or seafood. Some more good options are fish in 'plaki' sauce (broiled with tomato sauce and garlic), souvlaki (lamb marinated in lemon juice, olive oil and herbs, and then skewered and grilled) and dolmas (grape leaves stuffed with ground meat, rice and pine nuts). These are all steamed or baked dishes. And if you will simply perish without baklava for dessert, remember that the usual single portion size can serve two or three people more than adequately. Therefore, order accordingly.

Chinese

Chinese food has its share of offenders-hefty sodium content, high fat and big portion sizes, usually due to the Indianization of the

Are you diabetic?

Look for high fibre, low-fat dishes. A few great choices are beans, peas and lentils, and dark green vegetables like broccoli, cabbage, spinach and kale. Choose whole grain foods like brown rice, whole wheat bread and pasta and opt for fruits. Everyone, including people with diabetes, should eat three servings of fruit a day.

Are you watching your heart?

Skip foods high in saturated fat-foods that are fried or have a crispy coating, cream-based soups and salad dressings, and creamy cheese sauces and gravies. Don't add extra salt anything.

Are you watching your waist?

All the above rules apply. Also watch your portions, skip the desserts and go slow on carbs (breads). Load up on fibre (salad and grains) and protein (lean cuts).

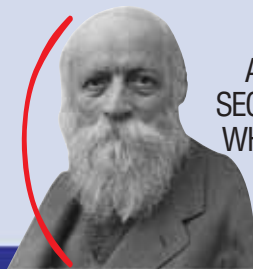
Do you have a long day ahead?

Add nuts to your salad and an olive oil-based dressing; have a decent-sized helping of whole wheat bread or brown rice and substantial amounts of grilled chicken or fish.

Chinese recipes-the so-called 'Indian Chinese food' (because traditional Chinese cooking is rather light and healthy). Are you wondering what to pick? Oyster, black bean and soy sauces are full of sodium and monosodium glutamate (MSG). Look out for these words on the menu card and don't hesitate to ask the chef about the ingredients before ordering anything. Deep fat frying is very common, especially in the appetizers, so go easy on fried wontons and egg or spring rolls. Instead, try steamed egg or spring rolls. Order steamed white rice or plain noodles instead of the fried versions (steamed Chinese brown rice is tasty and filling). Be wary of the word 'crispy' as this indicates that the dish is usually deep-fried, as is most of the meat in any dish labelled 'sweet and sour'. Instead, choose a roasted or grilled meat with the sweet and sour sauce on the side (always order sauce on the side and just drizzle some on top). Eat the way the Chinese really do to stay healthy for the long haul-eat a lot of vegetables. Besides, nowhere else do vegetables taste as delicious as they do in Chinese dishes. Always start with a soup, especially a vegetable base one and round off with a cup of Chinese tea to help wash all the food down.

# IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF RAM

To relive the glory of *bhanja* Ram, Chhattisgarh Tourism launches a new religious tourism circuit, titled Ram Van Gaman Paripath, covering the spots touched by Lord Ram, Mata Sita and brother Lakshman during their exile in the state. **NAVNEET MENDIRATTA** shares the story of the grand launch of the trail

There is a quaint little village near Raipur in Chhattisgarh that is said to be the parental home of Mata Kaushalya, Raja Dashrath's wife and mother of Lord Ram. In the village is the only temple in the world that is dedicated to her. The region was said to be a part of Dakshin Kaushal or Kaushal *raaj*, where Mata Kaushalya came from.

Taking pride in being his maternal home, people of the state see Ram as the nephew of the land (*bhanja* in Hindi). It is said that Ram spent 10 out of 14 years of his exile in the forests of Dakshin Kaushal.

The people of the region, in fact, have unique tradition binds the *mama* and *bhanja* together in a deeper and reverent way. In honour of Lord Ram, even today, the people put the nephew on a pedestal and, irrespective of the age, the uncle (*mama*) pays obeisance to the nephew (*bhanja*) instead of the other way around.

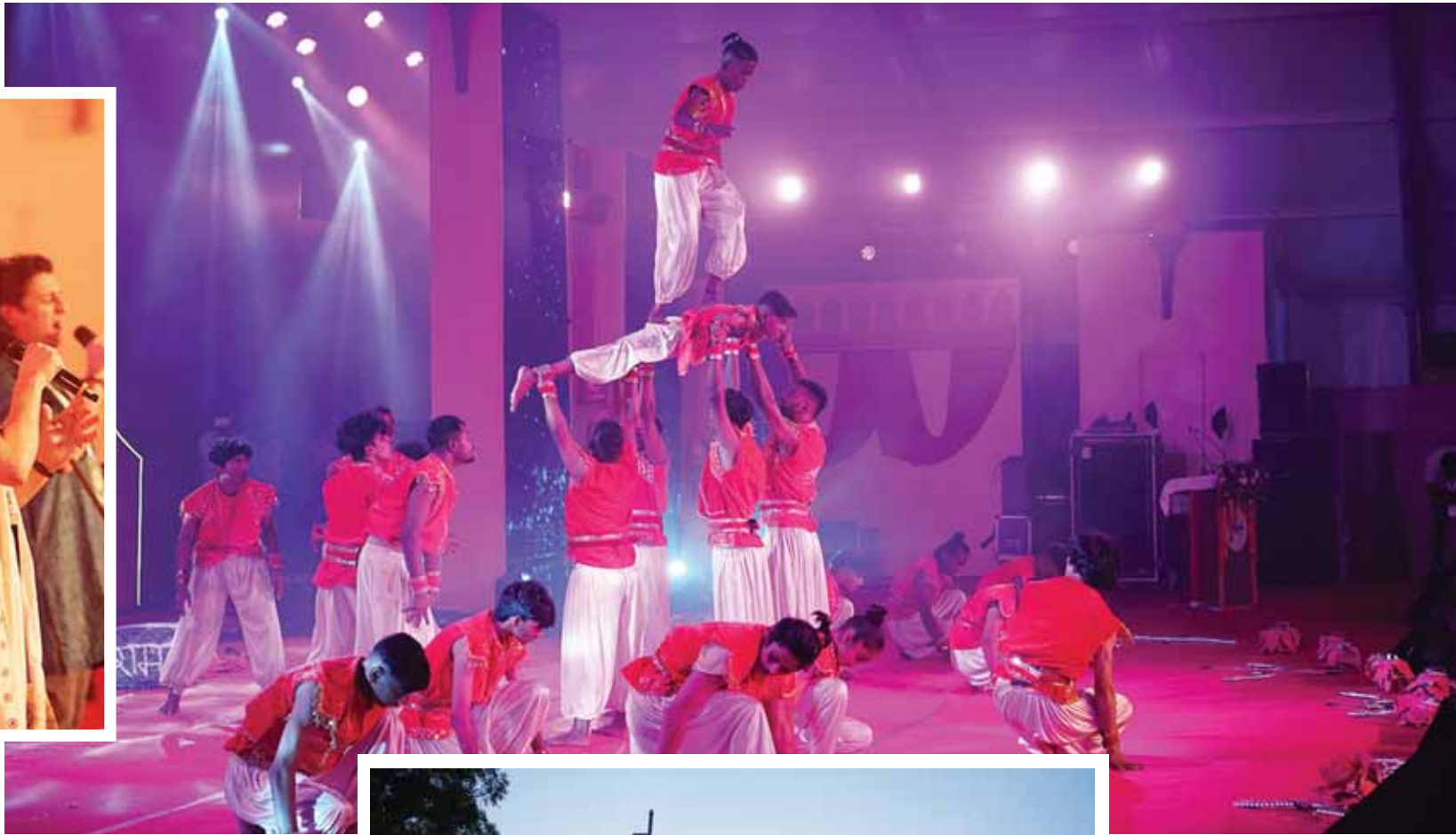
And now for the very first time, the Chhattisgarh government has taken it upon itself to mark the trail and promote it as a tourism circuit. Called Ram Van Gaman Paripath (RGVP), this circuit will cover nine spots along the forested route taken by Lord Ram, before he entered Maharashtra.

Covering a length of 3,000 kms, the Chhattisgarh section of the path starts from Korla district in the north to Sukma in the southern-most part of the state. The nine sites that make a part of the first phase include: Sitamarhi-Harchowka, Ramgarh, Shivrinarayan, Turturiya, Chandkhuri, Rajim, Sihawa, Jagdalpur and Ramaram.

It is believed Lord Ram entered Chhattisgarh from Sitamarhi-Harchowka area in Korla district. Located on the banks of Mawai River, the Seetamadhi-Harchowka's cave houses 17 chambers in it. A structure marked *Sita ki raso* is indicative of their stay here, believe the locals. People also believe that Ram worshipped the Shivaling during his stay in the cave.

Moving onward with his journey, Ram left Ghaghra and arrived at Kotadol, crossing the Ramgarh hills in Sarguja district. Ramgarh is known for Sita Bengra and Jogimara caves. The locals believe Lord Ram spent a few days of his exile along with Mata Sita and brother Lakshman in these caves. The caves also find a mention in Kalidasa's famous piece of literary art *Meghdootam*. Ramgarh is also renowned for one of the oldest '*natyashala*' (amphitheatre) where *Meghdootam* was composed.

The next location is where Lord Ram is said to have accepted the berries offered by Shabari. It is said that Shabari (a tribal woman) had tasted the berries one by one to ensure that she fed only the sweetest ones to Ram. Called Shivrinarayan, the location is a now small town located at the Triveni Sangam (the intersection of 3

rivers) — Shivnath, Jonk and Mahanadi in the Janjgir Champa district.

The village of Turturiya is where Rishi Valmiki had his *ashram*. The ashram is said to be where Sita gave birth to the twins, Luv and Kush. This place is of great religious and cultural significance as it here where Maharishi Valmiki is said to have written his epic work, *Ramayana*, that brought the legend of Ram to the world.

Chandkhuri sits in the middle of the trail. As you move south, you come to Rajim, where Lord Ram is said to have spent some time of his exile in the ashram of Rishi Lomash. Rajim is located at the confluence of the Mahanadi, Sondhur and Pairi rivers and is also known as the *Prayag* of Chhattisgarh. The Shivaling, believed to have been established by Mata Sita, is now housed inside the famous Kuleshwar Mahadev temple. It is said that even today during the floods, the Shivaling does not get submerged.

Sihawa, the revered place of *Sapt rishis* (seven sages) is the place of origin of the divine Mahanadi River. According to a folklore, Lord Ram spent a significant amount of his time at this place meeting and consulting the seven great sages — namely Shringi Rishi, Muchkund Rishi, Agastya Rishi, Angira Rishi, Kankar Rishi, Sharabhang Rishi and Gautama Rishi.

In Jagdalpur are situated the historic Kutumsar Caves, where Lord Ram



is said to have spent considerable time. Located in the famous Bastar district, Jagdalpur was the capital of the erstwhile princely state of Bastar. Even today, a 500-year-old festival, 'Bastar Dussehra', is held that runs for 75 days a year.

The ninth destination in the trail is Ramaram in the Sukma district. This is where Lord Ram is said to have worshipped Bhoomi Devi, a Hindu deity representing the earth. It is believed that you can see the footprints of Lord Ram even today.

The entire trail can be covered over

a period of 10 days, shared Anbalagan P, Secretary Tourism, Chhattisgarh. According to him, these are only nine of the 75 locations on the trail that the state plans to develop over time.

The state is also looking at hosting several festivals to push tourism in the state over the next few years, shared the State Chief Minister, Bhupesh Baghel. "We want the tourists to experience the state hospitality and view it as a religious, cultural and ethnic tourist destination," he said.

It was with this objective that the Chhattisgarh Tourism Board held a

grand launch of the trail on the first day of Navratras. A 51-feet high statue of Ram set against the ancient Mata Kaushalya temple was unveiled. The temple complex wears a grand look following the beautification drive undertaken by the government.

The grand event, curated by Yasmin Kidwai of Springbox Films along with Brandwidth Events, saw a musical opening dedicated to Lord Ram. Local as well as famous national artistes, such as Shankar Mahadevan, Indian Ocean, Kabir Café, Sukriti Sen and V.Unbeatable, participated in the event that was heavily attended by the locals. Noted actor Ashish Vidyarthi played the emcee of the evening. A 3-D film showcasing Ram's story and connect with Chhattisgarh was also showcased. The tourism board also released a special song written by *Indian Ocean's* Himanshu Joshi that evokes the glory of Lord Ram and speaks of his relevance through the ages.

This, in fact, is the first of the many tourism campaigns that the state is planning to launch. Chhattisgarh is looking at hosting traditional as well contemporary festivals and events to create an inclusive tourism strategy. For a state that has been able to settle internal unrest, there is a lot to showcase to the world. The state is also working on creating a Buddhist circuit and connecting it the existing one. There is a lot that the travellers can expect from Chhattisgarh.
