# Digitisation in rural areas brings down land related disputes

Uttar Pradesh has witnessed a sharp decline in disputes related to agricultural and non-agricultural land largely due to the expediting of the digitisation process in rural areas and simplification of revenue collection procedures in the last four-and-a-half years of the

Yogi Adityanath government in the state. The state government started the online Varasat Campaign to free villagers from unnecessary land disputes and so far, more than 13.52 lakh cases pertaining to land disputes have been settled through this drive.

The Yogi government also started Swamitva Yojana (Gharauni) to get villagers their land ownership rights and empower them. Gharauni is done in the name of a female member of the family in order to protect rural women. The government has distributed rural residential records (Gharauni) to 2.74 lakh land owners in 2,006 villages of the state. In order to empower landless farmers in rural areas, the state government has also distributed 6,371.883 hectares of agricultural land belonging to village societies to 26,149 landless people. Furthermore,

577 hectares of land has been given to 72,264 families while ponds spread over an area of 24071.685 hectares have been allotted to fishermen. Besides, 9,106 hectares of land has been allotted to 7,438 pottery artists. "Soon after coming to office, the Yogi government simplified the rules to declare agricultural land as non-agricultural land to speed up the industrialisation process. The provision of declaring an agricultural land as non-agricultural land was implemented in view of the potential use of land for five years. The step has ben-

efited farmers a lot," a government spokesman said in Lucknow on Saturday. The official added that the rules and regulations for leasing out private land in the state were also simplified. "Now, account holders can lease out their land for 15 years for agricultural work and 30 years for setting up solar energy plants. The Yogi government has taken several steps in the last four-and-a-half years to make life in villages easy through better infrastructure and improve the quality of life of the rural folk in Uttar Pradesh," he said.

## CM to attend BJP's Backward Classes convention today

Chief Minister Y o g i Adityanath will attend a Backward Classes convention being organised by the Bharatiya Janata Party on Sunday. All prominent party leaders of Backward Classes will also participate in the conference.

In view of the upcoming Uttar Pradesh assembly elections in 2022, the BJP has planned to hold Backward Classes conventions across the state and the first of these conventions will be held in Lucknow on Sunday.

The chief minister is expected to list the achievements of the state and Central governments towards Backward Classes welfare and the positions they have been given in the organisation and the government.



## SP to field NS Verma for Dy Speaker post

The opposition Samajwadi Party has announced to field Narendra Singh Verma as its candidate for the election to the post of deputy speaker of UP assembly. Verma is the six-term MLA from Sitapur district.

The tenure of the current 17th UP Vidhan Sabha ends on March 14, 2022 and there is hardly three months' time for the assembly polls.

A UP assembly special session has been convened for election of the deputy speaker on October 18. The nomination for the deputy speaker post will be accepted by the returning officer on October 17 between 11 am 1 am, UP assembly officials said here on Saturday.

Meanwhile, Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav has directed all the party MLAs to be present at the state party office at 2 pm on Sunday.

Verma, a six-time MLA from Mahmoodabad assembly constituency in Sitapur district, is presently deputy leader of the party in the House. Though SP has just 49 members in the assembly, highest among the opposition, but it would get support of the rebel BSP members. However, the SP contesting the election will be only for the sake of contesting the elections as the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party has an overwhelming majority in the House with over 310 MLAs.

The Samajwadi Party mocked the BJP-led government for holding the election for deputy speaker after four-and-a-half years of its rule. This will be the first such election in 14 years. BJP's alliance partner Apna Dal has pitched in for an OBC or Dalit face for the deputy speaker's post. The BJP is likely to field Nitin Agarwal, a defector from the Samajwadi Party. The petition for his disqualification from the membership of the House was recently rejected by UP Assembly Speaker Hriday Narayan Dikshit.

"What is the urgency? If it was felt that a deputy speaker was required for a better functioning of the House then why was it not done earlier. What is the need now after four-and-a-half years as there would be just about two months left," asked leader of opposition Ram Govind Chaudhary, adding that if the ruling party was recommending some name, opposition leaders had not been consulted so far.

Ram Govind Chaudhary said that the one-day assembly session on October 18 was a "BJP tactic" to divert people's attention from the "real issues".

Bahujan Samaj Party Legislature Party leader Shah Alam alias Guddu Jamali said the party was yet to decide its response. "But even then, we find it difficult to understand the meaning of such an election so close to the assembly polls... As far as we know, as per the tradition of the House, the deputy speaker is elected from opposition and with their consent. No one has contacted us so far," Chaudhary said.

## I'm full-time, hands-on Cong prez, avers Sonia

**Rahul hints at taking party helm; Cong prez election in Aug-Sept 2022**

PNS ■ NEW DELHI

The crucial meeting of the Congress Working Committee on Saturday saw Sonia Gandhi asserting herself as a "full-time and hands-on Congress president" and Rahul Gandhi hinting at his return at the helm of the party. The CWC decided to hold the election of Congress president between August 21 and September 20, 2022.

Sonia hit back at critics within the party — the G-23 — who have been pushing for over a year now for an organisational overhaul and a more "visible leadership".

The G-23 is a group of 23 senior leaders, including Ghulam Nabi Azad, Kapil Sibal, Shashi Tharoor, P Chidambaram among others. Since last August, members of the G-23 have been vocal on several party issues, including that of leadership crisis.

"I have always appreciated frankness" and "there is no need to speak to me through

the media," Sonia said at the first offline CWC meeting post-Covid pandemic.

Sources said the organisational elections were discussed amid indications that Rahul could return as the party chief same time around next year. "I am, if you will

allow me to say so, a full-time and hands-on Congress president," Sonia observed.

In the past two years, a large number of young colleagues have taken leadership roles in taking party policies and programmes to the people, she asserted.

Addressing the meeting of the party's highest decision-making body, Sonia also underscored that the entire organisation wants a revival of the party, but this requires unity and keeping the party's interests paramount.

## 2 more martyred; LeT top ultra killed in J&K

**Total 9 Army jawans dead in op to flush out terrorists**

With the recovery of two more bodies from the encounter site in the Nar Khas forest area of Mendhar tehsil in Poonch late on Saturday evening, the death toll of the Indian Army has mounted to nine, including two JCOs and seven other ranks. So far this is the highest toll in any recent counter terrorist operation in Jammu & Kashmir in recent years.

Meanwhile, in a joint operation with the Central forces, the Jammu & Kashmir Police on Saturday avenged the killing of their two colleagues by successfully eliminating one of the top Lashkar-e-Tayyeba commanders, along with his associate, in the Pampore area of South Kashmir's Pulwama district. The LeT commander, identified as Umar Mushtaq Khandey, had figured in the most wanted list of 10 terrorists prepared by the J&K Police.

In the first incident involving the Army, during the search operations and a brief firefight

with the terrorists, the Army jawans had received critical injuries late on Thursday evening.

Two dead bodies were recovered on Friday, while searches continued as one JCO and another jawan was found missing since October 14.

On October 11, five soldiers, including a Junior Commissioner Officer (JCO), were killed in action during an encounter with the terrorists in a thickly forested area of Dera Ki Gali in Surankote tehsil of frontier Poonch district.

Among the martyred soldiers three hailed from Punjab and one each from Uttar Pradesh

and Kerala.

Defence PRO Lt-Col Devender Anand in a statement said, "Subedar Ajay Singh and Naik Harendra Singh of Indian Army were killed in action during search operations being conducted by the Indian Army along with the Jammu & Kashmir Police in densely forested area of Nar Khas forest in Mendhar, Poonch."

Lt-Col Anand said, "Subedar Ajay Singh and Naik Harendra Singh were part of search operations launched by the security forces to flush out terrorists hiding in the forested area."

## Nihang Sikh surrenders for lynching at Singhu border

A Nihang Sikh, Parminder Singh, on Saturday surrendered at a gurdwara before police in Amarkot village in Jandiala Guru area of Amritsar in connection with the Singhu border lynching incident.

A police team had gone to arrest him. He had announced to surrender after paying obeisance at Akal Takht. Parminder Singh allegedly murdered Lakhbir Singh, a drug addict, who it is alleged had committed sacrilege.

Meanwhile, a court in Sonapat on Saturday remanded Sarabjit Singh, arrested in connection with the lynching of Lakhbir Singh at the farmers' protest site at Singhu border, in police custody for seven days, with the accused pointing to the involvement of a few more people in the gruesome killing.

The body of Lakhbir Singh, a labourer from Punjab's Tarn Taran district, was found on Friday tied to a barricade at the Delhi-Haryana border where the anti-farm law protesters have been camping.

## Hindu's body found; B'desh Durga Puja attacks toll rises to 5

The Durga Puja celebrations have concluded in Bangladesh even as another Hindu devotee was found dead on Saturday amid days of communal unrest and violence unleashed by unidentified Muslim bigots who vandalised temples over alleged blasphemy, leading to the deployment of paramilitary forces in more than half of administrative districts. With the latest killing, the death toll during the Durga Puja celebrations across the country has reached five.

Authorities overnight imposed a nationwide security vigil while officials said that initial investigations have thrown up crucial evidence against the perpetrators of violence against the minority Hindu community's Durga Puja. The paramilitary Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) has expanded the vigil from 22 to 34 out of 64 administrative districts.

The elite anti-crime Rapid Action Battalion said it expects to arrest some of the key perpetrators of the sporadic violence which took place in the past three days. Voicing opti-

mism over the investigation, Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal told reporters that "We expect developments of the investigations in the next one or two days".

The police, meanwhile, said that they have recovered the body of a Hindu devotee from a pond near a temple in southeastern Begumganj sub-district of Noakhali.

## Six people dead, dozen reported missing as rain lashes Kerala

At least six people died and a dozen others were missing on Saturday as heavy rain pounded south and central Kerala causing flash floods and landslides in many parts, prompting the State Government to seek the assistance of the defence forces for rescue operations.

Several people have been injured and displaced in rain-related incidents in Kerala where dams in many districts are nearing its full capacity and small towns and villages in the hilly areas are totally cut off from the outside world.

Many hilly areas of Kottayam, Idukki and Pathanamthitta are experiencing situation almost similar to that during the time of devastating floods of 2018 and 2019 but authorities said everything was under control and there was no need for any panic. However, the rescue teams of the State police and fire force could not reach the affected areas due to floods and adverse weather conditions prevailing there.

## 30% deprived of water, soap at home!

### 2.3 bn vulnerable to Covid across world: UNICEF

Amid Covid-19 pandemic, hand washing has become a new norm to keep the deadly virus at bay, but ironically globally three in 10 people, or 2.3 billion, do not have basic facilities like water and soap available at home, the UNICEF has said, suggesting that the have-nots remain at the risk of getting infected with coronavirus. The situation is worse in the least developed countries, with over six in 10 people without access to basic hand



hygiene, the UN agency said in a fact sheet on Global Hand Washing Day observed on October 15. The cost to provide hand hygiene in all homes in 46 of the world's least developed countries by 2030 is an esti-

mated at \$11 billion. Nonetheless, what has come as a relief is that some progress has been made since 2015: The global population with access to basic hand hygiene at home has increased

from 5 billion to 5.5 billion, or from 67 per cent to 71 per cent.

However, if current trends persist, 1.9 billion people will still not have access to basic hand hygiene by the end of the decade. According to the latest estimates, two in five schools worldwide do not have basic hygiene services with water and soap, affecting 818 million students, of which 462 million attend schools with no facility at all. In the least developed countries, seven out of 10 schools have no place for children to wash their hands.

One-third of health care facilities worldwide do not have hand hygiene facilities at points of care where the patient, health care worker, and treatment involve contact with the patient.

# Mayawati condemns killing of dalit youth at Singhu border

Calling the killing of a man near the Singhu border where farmers are protesting against three farm laws since November last year, as sad and shameful, Bahujan Samaj Party chief Mayawati on Saturday asked the "Dalit" Chief Minister of Punjab Charanjit Singh Channi to provide financial aid of Rs 50 lakh to kin of the deceased.

Taking to Twitter, the BSP chief also said strict action should be taken against the culprits as done in the "Lakhimpur Kheri violence".

"The brutal murder of a Dalit youth of Punjab on the Delhi-Singhu border is very sad and shameful. The Haryana government should take the incident seriously and the state police should take strict action against the culprits as the police did in Lakhimpur Kheri. The Dalit CM of Punjab should give Rs 50 lakh and a government job to the victim's family, this is the demand of BSP," tweeted Mayawati.



The body of a Dalit farm labourer from Punjab, Lakhbir Singh, 35, was on Friday found tied to an overturned police barricade at the Singhu border where farmers are protesting against the Centre's agri laws. His left hand was chopped off and his body had over 10 wounds caused by

sharp-edged weapons. Hours after the macabre crime, a man wearing the blue robe of Sikhs' Nihang order appeared before the media, claiming that he had "punished" the victim for "desecrating" a Sikh holy book.

Mayawati further compared the road mishap in Chhattisgarh's Jashpur district, where a car ran over a group of people walking to immerse an idol of Goddess Durga, with the Lakhimpur Kheri incident and asked Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel to take strict action against the accused.

"The incident of death of one person and injuries to many people in Chhattisgarh during Durga Visarjan is very sad, which is reminiscent of the Lakhimpur Kheri incident. The Congress government should give financial help and jobs to the families of the victims and take strict action against the culprits," Mayawati tweeted.

A speeding car on Friday evening allegedly mowed down one person and left 16 others injured in a procession that was heading for Durga idol immersion in Pathalgaon block of Jashpur district.

## Durga Puja, Dussehra celebrated peacefully

Durga Puja and Dussehra were celebrated peacefully in Uttar Pradesh. Police claimed that no incident of violence was reported from anywhere across the state.

Additional Director General of Police (Law and Order) Prashant Kumar attributed the success to the coordinated efforts of the police, administration, and the citizens of the state.

Kumar said that drones were used to monitor sensitive areas where incidents were reported in the past. He also said that from 38 incidents of violence being reported in 2016, not a single incident was reported in 2021.

Specific guidelines and directions were issued to Balrampur district which had reported five incidents of violence in 2016, but for the last two years not a single incident was reported from there, the ADG added.

The districts where the incident was reported in these two years (2018-19) included Baharaich, Kaushambi, Gonda, Pratapgarh, Agra, Faizabad, Amethi, Azamgarh, Basti.

"Officials in all these districts were instructed to remain alert and also resolve all the issues and senior officers were asked to visit the spots where the incidents took place and meet the local leaders and strike a chord with locals," the ADG said.

## Ashirwad Path sabhas getting immense public support: RLD

the path of economic progress of all sections and a special fund of Rs 2,500 crores for agriculture startups.

Besides, a guaranteed security scheme for all sections of society, including minorities, will also be started if the RLD was voted to power.

Jayant has also promised the establishment of Allahabad High Court benches in Western Uttar Pradesh, Bundelkhand and Purvanchal so that the general public can get accessible justice.

# Missing teenager killed by kin for money

A 17-year-old boy, who went missing near his house in Fatehabad area of Barabanki on October 14 afternoon, was abducted for ransom and later killed by one of his kin and an aide and his body was found dumped in a drain in his native place on Saturday morning.

The police which had been probing the incident through electronic surveillance later arrested the victim's kin, Satyendra Kumar of Ballia, and his cohort Nagendra of Bahraich district. The police also recovered the deceased's mobile phone, an iron pan

used to kill the victim, a motorcycle and a pair of slippers belonging to the deceased.

As per reports, lawyer Boondi Lal Gautam and his wife who is a government school teacher reside in the Fatehabad area of Barabanki. Their 17-year-old son was pursuing his studies from Lucknow and had enrolled at a coaching institute to prepare for competitive examinations. Due to the short distance between the state capital and Fatehabad, the youth used to frequent his home on a motorcycle.

Meanwhile, his kin Satyendra worked as a mason and started staying in a rented

accommodation in the Lakhperabagh area closeby. Right from his stay in Barabanki, Satyendra eyed the victim's properties and financial status and hit upon the idea of kidnapping the teenager to extort a ransom from the family. To actualise his nefarious plan, Satyendra befriended Nagendra who used to stay at nearby Safdarganj area. As he frequented the victim's house, Satyendra knew about the teenager's travel itinerary.

Around 2 pm on October 14, as the teenager left his home on a bike, Satyendra intercepted him some distance away and coaxed him to have

a couple of beers and took him to his rented house in Lakhperabagh where Nagendra was present.

After getting drunk to the gills, Satyendra asked the victim to call his family and ask for a huge sum as ransom, faking that he had been kidnapped. When the victim refused, a verbal spat took place. Watching his plan go astray, Satyendra hit the victim on his head with an iron pan causing a deep gash that profusely bled. His aide Nagendra then strangled the victim to death.

The assailants then put the victim's cell phone on flight

mode, took his body in a sack and dumped it in a drain.

Upon their return to the rented house, they switched on the victim's phone when his brother Anurag called. Nagendra took the call posing as kidnapper 'Rafiq', demanded Rs 60 lakh as ransom for the victim's release and immediately switched off the phone.

But since the incident had earlier been informed to the police, a surveillance unit managed to get their possible location and dropped the net on the assailants. Based on confessions made by the miscreants, the police recovered the victim's body from a nearby drain.

# Only five new ve+ cases but don't let guard down: ACS

Only five new cases of coronavirus infection were detected during the testing of 1.23 lakh samples across Uttar Pradesh in the last 24 hours. During this period, eight people recovered from COVID-19 infection and at present the state has 129 active cases

Till date, the state has tested more than 8.12 crore samples for the deadly disease.

Additional Chief Secretary (Medical and Health) Amit Mohan Prasad told newsmen in Lucknow that Covid vaccination was being carried out across the state continuously and on Friday, a total of 77,196 doses of the vaccine were administered.

"Till Friday, the first dose of the vaccine had been administered to more than 9.22 crore people while 2.55 crore residents of the state have been totally vaccinated after being given both doses. Coronavirus infection is under control in the state but the pandemic is not over yet. Therefore, people should follow Covid norms and in case of any problem, contact Covid Helpline 18001805145," the senior official said.

## Health dept to speed up vaccination drive



**Lucknow (PNS):**With the Covid vaccination figures ranging between 14,000-19,000 per day over the last few days, the Health department is set to give an impetus to the drive. CMO Dr Manoj Agarwal said they would be administering vaccine jabs in malls for urban population while mobile vans would be pressed into service in rural areas. The CMO also held a meeting with the members of Akhil Bharatiya Vyapar Udyog Mandal in which he said that

77 percent of the eligible population has taken the first dose in Lucknow. He also urged the traders to identify spaces in the malls and shopping areas where vaccinations could be carried out on a daily basis. The CMO said that on the spots identified by the traders, vaccinations will be carried out from 12 noon to 8 pm daily till Diwali. The CMO also urged the traders to cooperate in curbing the use of tobacco and tobacco products in public areas.

## Woman harassed by husband, in-laws for dowry

**Lucknow (PNS):** A woman accused her husband and in-laws belonging to Kurnool in Andhra Pradesh, of harassing her for dowry. The case was registered at Vibhuti Khand police station. The complainant, Ayushi, alleged that her father gave Rs 8 lakh to her husband Madhusoodan, who works with a private company, at the time of marriage in 2019.

She alleged that Madhusoodan and her in-laws were pressuring her to bring Rs 10 lakh more as he wanted to start his own business.

"Madhusoodan and his parents would thrash me over petty issues after my father said he was unable to give more dowry. I conceived in due course of time and was sent to Lucknow for delivery. I stayed

with my parents for six months and neither Madhusoodan nor his parents tried to contact me. My father sent me to Andhra Pradesh on my request. Madhusoodan's behaviour did not change and he and his parents again pressured me to bring Rs 10 lakh," she stated in the complaint. She alleged that Madhusoodan and his parents insulted her father who reached Andhra to broker peace, and she was turned out of the house.

A man was accused of raping a minor girl when she was returning home in Mohanlalganj police station area. Her family alleged that the accused, Vinod Yadav, caught hold of the girl and warned her against speaking up.

# VHP to prepare 10,000 idols of Ganesha, Lakshmi

In a first, volunteers of the Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) have set a target of preparing 10,000 idols of God Ganesha and Goddess Lakshmi as well as 25,000 diya of cow dung at a gaushala (cow shelter) in Baharia block in trans-Ganga pocket of Prayagraj district.

VHP regional secretary (Gaurakaha) Lal Mani Tiwari told the newsmen this is the first time that VHP's gaushala will prepare around 25,000 diya and 10,000 idols of god and goddess at Shri Prem Gaushala Anusandhan Trust in village Nari, under the Baharia block. We have engaged three SHGs, around 33 women workers, for making diya and idols and production has already started.

Tiwari said, 'If the trial is successful, we will take up production of diya and idols

at other gaushalas from next year.'

'Eco-friendly cow dung diya and idols have been trending since last year and many people have taken to them as a green way of celebrating the festival of lights and sound. Now, the denizens are ditching clay diya and instead rooting for those made of cow dung as they see it as a way of empowering gaushalas and local communities,' he added.

Tiwari opined that 'if the sale of diya and idols goes better, it will help gaushala authorities in better upkeep of cows. These diya will be manually made by women SHGs and gaushala owner'.

Normally, many people in rural areas buy cow dung for cleaning the house before Diwali, but this time adequate diya and idols will be available at prominent city markets.

The diya and idols will be made under the supervision of

Dinesh Mishra.

Local VHP leaders, meanwhile, claimed they are preparing cow dung diya for the first time. 'We are making two kinds of cow dung diya: one is made of wet dung and the other of dung powder'.

'The wet dung diya take an uneven shape and many customers might not be happy using them, while those made of cow dung powder are perfect,' said a woman volunteer. 'The dung powder is mixed with rice powder, vegetable gum and water. Once the diya dry up, a cotton wick dipped in ghee and glued to a small metal plate is placed inside them,' she said.

These diya will be available at cheaper rates. Interestingly, these diya easily burn for over half-an-hour if used with desi ghee.

Many VHP leaders said 'people will prefer to buy diya and idols made of cow dung as

cow is connected to our roots'.

**14 NEW DENGUE CASES REPORTED:** The city reported 14 new dengue cases on Saturday, taking the tally to 431. New cases were detected in Shankargarh (2), Mauaima (1), Manda (1), Saidabad (1), Bai Ka Bagh (1), Karanpur (1), Chota Baghara (1), Attarsuiya (1), Beli Colony (2), Lala Ki Saray (1), Newada (1) and Stanley road (1). Out of the 14 cases detected, nine were from city areas, while rest four were from rural areas.

Moreover, out of total 431 dengue cases in the district so far, 312 were in urban pockets, while the rest 119 were in rural areas. After witnessing a significant spike in dengue cases in urban areas, officials of the Health department on Friday intensified the anti-larvae spraying drive in Chota Baghara, Beli Colony, Newada, Stanley road and Bai Ka Bagh areas.

She said the university should on top priority introduce entrepreneurship development and vocational studies for its students. She said the current age was that of unprecedented global and technological transformation and over 50 per cent of the activities would be automated, generating completely new roles, responsibilities and challenges for the future workforce and thus the onus rested on the universities to understand the future needs of the students. She said entrepreneurship education encouraged creativity, innovation, and collaboration among the students.

Patel said today's students

needed to learn how to identify problems before they learnt how to solve them. She said a problem could be solved only if it was identified and described as well. She said the entrepreneurship journey required passion and sustained persistence than most other activities. She said the university students need to be seasoned to seek and solve problems. She said apart from this focus had to be laid on vocational studies which made the students identify the difference between theoretical knowledge and practical skills. She said in the absence of the theoretical knowledge one did not have the work experience that helped them transition from a classroom study topic into their actual profession.

Patel advised that the university should also focus on the needs of the adopted villages and issues like schools, hospital, tree plantation, pregnancy, nutrition, clean potable water malnutrition and awareness among the villagers. She said the university should focus on rooting out the social evils.

CSJMU Vice Chancellor Prof Vinay Pathak said the university had prepared a portal and thus the faculty would upload their related data which would help in NACH evaluation. Prominent among those present in the meeting were Additional Chief Secretary to Governor, MK Gupta, Dr Pankaj Johnny, Director of University Institute of Health Sciences, Dr Pravin Katiyar and several others.

# Tension in village as two youths attempt to molest two girls

Tension prevailed in Ishwariganj village under Sachendi police station when two local goons attempted to molest two girls returning home from Dussehra Mela late Friday night.

When the family members of the victim girls protested, they were brutally beaten up by the goons, who also pelted stones at the house of the victim girls.

During the scuffle and stone-pelting, several members of the girls' family were injured.

Police sent the injured to hospital and launched raids to nab the assailants.

According to reports, three girls of a family along with two neighbouring women had gone to see Dussehra Mela on Friday evening. After participating in the Mela celebrations, when they were returning home, Ribbu Singh and Raja Singh of the village started teasing two of the girls near Binnaur crossing. Both the youths also attempted to drag these girls with them. When the women accompanying the girls protested, both the youths escaped from there.

On reaching the house, both the girls informed the other family members of the incident. Immediately, the irate family members rushed to the house of both the youths and registered a protest against

their move. During the heated arguments that followed, the two youths and their family members indulged in scuffle with the victims' kin. They also stoned at the house of the victim girls.

In the incident, several members of the victims' family were injured and they filed a complaint with the police. All the injured were sent to the community health centre (CHC) in Barasirohi for treatment.

Station House Officer of Sachendi, Satish Rathaur, said after registering the FIR, he had deputed two teams to nab the accused youths for initiating stern penal action against them.

**YOUTH KILLED IN ROAD ACCIDENT:** A motorcyclist was killed while his friend was seriously injured when a truck knocked down their motorcycle and dragged it up to half-a-kilometer near Haraha village under Bidhnu police station late Friday night.

The condition of the injured youth was stated to be critical. Police have impounded the truck and started an investigation.

According to reports, Pradeep Shukla (37) of Shahjahanpur, Gajner (Kanpur Dehat) along with his friend Santosh Singh had gone to his relative's house in Naubasta, Kanpur, on Friday. Both were returning home late in the night. Near Haraha village, a truck knocked the motorcycle

down from behind. As the motorcycle fell, it along with the youths got entangled with the truck and they were dragged a long distance. The truck driver applied brakes only after other vehicle drivers overtook him and raised an alarm.

On coming across the incident, the truck driver immediately escaped leaving his vehicle on the spot.

The passersby informed the police and shifted the injured to a nearby community health centre.

Police identified the injured and informed their kin. At the CHC, Pradeep was pronounced dead by the doctors while Santosh was referred to LLR Hospital in Kanpur after the first aid.

Station House Officer Atul Kumar Singh said the truck had been impounded and action would be taken against the guilty on the basis of the complaint lodged by the kin of the deceased.

**SIGNAL TESTING GOING ON AT KANPUR METRO:** Signal installation on the priority section of the Kanpur Metro has been completed and signal testing is being carried out on top priority.

In view of the proposed trial run on the 9 km long priority corridor (IIT-Motijheel) in November 2021, Uttar Pradesh Metro Rail Corporation Limited

(UPMRC) commenced the testing of the signaling system in the Metro Depot, located near Gurudev Chauraha.

The first train set is being prepared for trial on the test track in the Depot and before that signals are being charged and tested.

The process known as 'Signaling Power on Test' was carried out and out of a total of 29 signals to be installed in the depot, 27 have already been installed. The mainline is to be equipped with 43 signals, out of which, 35 signals have been placed. Currently, signal installation work is pending at the Motijheel Metro station only and that too will be complete soon.

Metro train's movement will be controlled with three coloured signals viz. Red, Violet and Green. While red is to stop, violet signal allows for conditional proceed (movement with a prescribed low-speed limit). This signal is shown when another train is in the vicinity. Green refers to the clear route and the driver can proceed freely with the allowed speed limit.

Another kind of signal is for movement inside the depot and this signal has three white lights. When two lights glow horizontally, the driver is instructed to stop and when two lights glow at a 45 degree angle, the train is allowed to proceed. This signal was called 'Shunt Signal'.

## KDA to provide top amenities in its housing projects

Kanpur Development Authority (KDA) is all set to provide all amenities in its housing projects that are available in townships developed by the private builders.

It has decided to develop the pilot projects on the pattern of 'corporate culture' with the help of police and the municipal corporation for ensuring security to residents and providing civic amenities, including construction of surrounding roads.

Subject to availability of proper space in its projects, separate police outposts will also be set up there. The sewerage and potable water problems of residents will also be resolved by the KDA on priority.

It may be recalled that in a bid to tighten the noose around land mafia and people involved in developing townships illegally, The KDA is already organising special camps for quick approval of building layouts and attending to matters relating to mutation and registry of properties. This will save them from running after the KDA officers for getting their work done.

With the allotment of ID to each KFA allottee, the details of installments deposited by him/her will be available on the computer to facilitate easy verification by the KDA staff. The entire system is being spearheaded by KDA Vice Chairman Arvind Singh himself, and this has checked the syndicate involved in unnecessary harassment of innocent allottees.

In the special camps organised to approve building plans two times in the past, around 175 layouts were approved within a few hours. Similarly, the KDA organised camps twice for executing registry (agreement to lease) to allottees of PM Awas Yojana flats.

Singh has directed the officials to ensure disposal of matters relating to layout approval, mutation and registry on priority. He has warned that any laxity on this account will attract stern disciplinary action against the guilty officials.

It may be recalled that in the matters of land acquisition in New Kanpur City and fake registries, penal action had been initiated against 13 officers/employees while two officers were shifted from their assignments for laxity in initiating action against illegal/unauthorised constructions.

## Youth battered to death in Panki

KANPUR (PNS): A youth was battered to death by some local goons near Ratanpur police outpost when he was returning home from Dussehra Mela in Panki police station area late Friday night.

The police have registered an FIR against three named and four unidentified persons and started investigation.

The preliminary investigation revealed that the youth was killed following a dispute between him and the assailants when he was returning from Dussehra Mela. On the basis of CCTV footage, the police are trying to identify the assailants and ascertain the cause of the incident.

According to Shiv Nand Tewari of Ratanpur Colony, his younger son Ajay Tewari alias Dipu (25) had an enmity with a local youth, Dharmendra Singh, over some issue since last year. He alleged that late Friday night, when Ajay was returning home from Dussehra Mela, Dharmendra Singh along with accomplices Sunil Chaturvedi, Dipu Bhadauria and four others cornered him near KESCO Crossing and had a heated argument with him and started beating him up. When Sunil Kumar of the victim's locality came to the rescue of Ajay, the assailants also beat him up. Sunil somehow escaped from there and informed Ajay's kin about the incident.

On reaching there, the kin found Ajay lying in a pool of blood. They immediately took him to LLR Hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

# Navy to review its readiness on Mon

The Navy top echelon will next week review the readiness of its fleet in the backdrop of China flexing its maritime muscle in the Indian Ocean and Indo-Pacific. The five-day Commanders' conference will commence here from Monday. Giving details here on Saturday, Navy officials said the conference, held twice a year, serves as a platform for Naval Commanders to discuss important maritime matters at the military-strategic level as well as interact with senior Government officials through an institutionalised forum. Due to the rapidly changing geostrategic situation of the region, the significance and importance of the Conference is manifold. It is an institutionalised platform to deliberate, direct, devise and decide issues of utmost importance, which will shape future course of the Indian Navy.

During the Conference, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will address and interact with the Naval Commanders on matters pertaining to national security. Among many issues being discussed, the Chief of the Naval Staff, along with other Naval Commanders, will review major operational, materiel, logistics, human resource development, training and administrative activities undertaken by the Indian Navy in the last few months and deliberate upon future plans for important activities and initiatives. The Navy has focused on being Combat Ready, Credible and Cohesive force and despite the Covid-19 pandemic, continues to assiduously execute its mandate. The Indian Navy has witnessed a significant growth in its operational tasking over the years in consonance with India's rising maritime interests. Indian Naval ships on

Mission Based Deployments across the Indian Ocean Region (IOR) have remained poised for quick response to any developing situation. Indian warships deployed in the Gulf of Aden and the Persian Gulf continue to provide security for trade flowing through these areas. In 2020-21, warships have undertaken multiple Covid related outreach missions to provide food and medical aid to IOR littoral nations and beyond as part of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region). The Chief of Defence Staff, and the Chiefs of Indian Army and Indian Air Force will also interact with the Naval Commanders to address convergence of the three Services vis-à-vis the operational environment, and on avenues for augmenting Tri-Service synergy.

## Air chief to visit forward areas along LoC to assess operational preparedness

Indian Air Force (IAF) chief IVR Chaudhari is visiting forward areas along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Ladakh to review operational readiness of the armed forces. This is his first visit after assuming the top job earlier this month.

The visit comes at a time when India and China are in a stand-off situation at some locations in Eastern Ladakh since May last year.

The two Corps Commanders have held 13 rounds of talks to ease tension at the LAC and find ways for early disengagement from the flash points.

Chaudhari arrived in Leh on Saturday and will visit forward areas.

He will also hold talks with the operational commanders of the IAF and the Army to take a sense of the situation there.

Even though Chaudhari took over as the IAF chief recently, he was handling the LAC flare up and resultant build up to protect the LAC as the Western Air Command chief and then as the Vice-Chief.

During the ongoing visit, Chaudhari will visit the forward air bases in the Ladakh region besides some positions where the troops are deployed to thwart any transgressions by the Chinese troops, sources said here on Saturday.



The IAF has also upgraded its facilities in the northern sector where troops have been stationed with the surface-to-air missiles to counter even slow moving helicopters.

The Air Force has also deployed the Rafale fighter aircraft along with the MiG-29 fighters to guard the LAC. In fact, the IAF has deployed all its front line fighter jets including the SU-30s and Jaguars at the airbases near the 4,000 KM LAC stretching from Ladakh in the north to Arunachal Pradesh in the east since June last year.

At present, more than 50,000 troops each from India and China are deployed along the LAC in Eastern Ladakh since May last year.

The two sides did not retreat in the winter months and are likely to stay put at all the flash points during the coming winter months.

Army Chief General M M Naravane had visited the LAC for two days on October one to take stock of the operational preparedness of his troops.

He reportedly also reviewed the preparations for deploying troops in the winter months.

# Jaishankar to visit Israel to strengthen bilateral ties

In a move to further strengthen ties between the two countries, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will visit Israel and hold talks with his counterpart Yair Lapid will focus to strengthen the strategic partnership. This will be Jaishankar's first visit to the country as External Affairs Minister.

The Ministry of External Affairs said here in a statement on Saturday Jaishankar will pay an official visit to Israel at the invitation of Alternate Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Lapid.

He will hold a bilateral meeting with Lapid and will also call on President Isaac Herzog, Prime Minister Naftali Bennett, and Knesset Speaker Mickey Levy during his visit.

India and Israel elevated bilateral relations to a strategic partnership during the historic visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to Israel in July 2017.

Since then, the relationship between the two countries has focused on expanding knowl-

edge-based partnership, which includes collaboration in innovation and research, including boosting the 'Make in India' initiative, the ministry said.

During his visit, Jaishankar will interact with the Indian-origin Jewish community in Israel, Indologists, Indian students who are currently pursuing their education in Israeli universities, and business people, including from the hi-tech industries, the statement said.

The visit will also be an occasion to pay tribute to the valiant Indian soldiers who laid their lives in the region, especially during the First World

War, it said. The visit is seen towards cementing diplomatic and political ties between the two countries in the post-Benjamin Netanyahu era.

Israel has emerged as a major defence partner of India since diplomatic ties were established in the early 1990s. Over the years, Israel has supplied technology for the Indian missile programme, sophisticated rifles, Phalcon airborne early warning radar system (AWACS), drones, sensors and other related equipment. The two countries also share close relationship in fighting terrorism through intelligence sharing and counter-terrorism operations. Jaishankar will first visit Dubai on Sunday and will then leave for Israel.

In the United Arab Emirates (UAE), the external affairs minister is likely to hold talks with the leadership there on issues like the situation in Afghanistan. Incidentally, the UAE established diplomatic relations with Israel under the Abraham Accord signed on August 13, 2020.

## NSG commandos deployed at Srinagar, Jammu airbases for anti-drone cover

Units of the National Security Guard (NSG) have been deployed at the Srinagar and Jammu airbases to provide anti-drone cover, paramilitary chief MA Ganapathy said on Saturday.

The move comes after Jammu air station was hit by drone attacks earlier this year. The NSG on Saturday celebrated its 37th raising at its campus in Manesar.

Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) conspired to execute the first-ever drone attack on June 27 at the Indian Air Force (IAF) station in Jammu where two unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), which came from across the border, dropped bombs, injuring two airmen and damaging a portion of a building.

The two IAF facilities in the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir are located close to the Pakistan border/Line of Control (LoC) respectively and are cat-



egorised as 'sensitive' locations.

## Four CRPF jawans injured in accidental fuse box explosion

Four CRPF jawans were injured when an ammunition fuse box exploded when it was being loaded on a train at the Raipur station on Saturday.

The 211 Company of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) was in the train when ammunition was being loaded on Saturday morning, the paramilitary said in a statement.

"Boxes of arms and ammunition were being loaded on the train by Head Constable Vikas Lakshman and other jawans. The ammunition fuse box exploded in Lakshman's hand near the toilet of the train's compartment," it said.

Due to the fuse box explosion, Lakshman got injured and he was immediately admitted to the Sreenarayana hospital in Raipur. Three other jawans also suffered some injuries and they were given first aid treatment at the station, the statement said.

The CRPF said that "a



case has been filed with the GRP railway station and it has directed to investigate the matter".

The special train was scheduled to carry the CRPF personnel to Jammu from Raipur, Raipur police said in Chattisgarh capital.

"A minor explosion was recorded in a special train of the CRPF at the Raipur railway station around 6.30 am today. The train was heading to Jammu from Jharsuguda (Odisha)." Raipur Superintendent of Police (SP) Prashant Agrawal said.

"The explosion occurred during the shifting of a container carrying detonators and HD cartridges. While shifting the container in train, it accidentally slipped in coach number-9, which led to the blast," the SP added.

## BJP slams Congress for 'not offering any comment' on Singhu border killing of dalit

Lashing out at the Congress for "not offering any comment" on the ghastly killing of a dalit at the Singhu-border, the BJP on Saturday asked the opposition whether it was supporting the "Talibani thinking" and the anti-social elements which are "misusing" farmers protests to further their own vested interests.

Addressing a press conference here, BJP's National Spokesman Gaurav Bhatia also took to task Bhartiya Kisan Union president Rakesh Tikait who is leading the farm stir, for saying that "organisers have no accountability towards the incident".

"Have professional protestors no responsibility towards their own citizens?", he asked. Bhatia accused the oppo-

sition, particularly the Congress, of keeping a silence for their "petty and cheap vote-bank politics".

"For petty and cheap vote-bank politics, the opposition, particularly the Congress, is maintaining a deafening silence. no courage to call a spade a spade as it does not suit their policies of convenience", he said.

On the killing of a dalit on



the Singhu-border, Bhatia wondered whether the Congress is subscribing to the Talibani traditions.

BJP leader said the anti-social elements have joined the protest and are firing guns from the shoulders of the agi-

tating farmers.

The BJP spokesperson referred to the statement from the Congress Working Committee and said Congress President' Sonia's "silence is dangerous" as the opposition party, he said is otherwise very

quick and regular on raising convenient issues on the farmers.

BJP said that "anarchists behind these protests need to be exposed as they are doing a great disservice to the nation".

"The professional protesters who are masking themselves as farmers are doing great disservice to the nation. Those who take the life of an innocent man, rape women and insult the tricolour and justify the killings of citizens as reaction to the action cannot be termed as farmers," Bhatia said.

The BJP leader also took pot-shots at Sonia's announce-

ment that she is a full-time and hands-on President, saying the Congress has once again moved on with its "all lies and create confusion politics" by brushing aside party's long internal strife and the subsequent issues raised by G-23 group within it.

"It is not CWC but PBWC- 'Parivar Bachao working committee", he quipped

BJP's IT Cell in-charge Amit Malviya also blamed Tikait for the Singhu-border incident. He took to Twitter to say that the gory murder would not have occurred if Rakesh Tikait had "not justified the mob lynching in Lakhimpur".

# Covid anthem released to mark 100-cr vax doses milestone

The Centre on Saturday released a Covid anthem, penned by singer Kailash Kher, in the run up to India crossing the landmark of 100-crore Covid-19 vaccine doses next week. While the anthem is aimed at dispelling the myths and shedding vaccine hesitancy, the Centre cautioned that it was too early to declare victory over the virus that has swept the world as well as India.

Till Saturday evening, as many as "97.23 crore have been administered the first dose of Covid vaccine in the country",

said Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya at an event here held to release the anthem.

So far, more than 101 crore Covid-19 vaccine doses have been provided to states and union territories so far while over 11.12 crore balance and unutilised vaccine doses are still available with the states and UTs.

The vaccines administered suggest about 70 per cent of the population getting at least one dose and about 30 per cent of the population has got two doses, said the Minister.

"We administered 2.5 crore doses one single day on September 17 and next week we



will reach the 100 crore mark," he said. "This has happened because of the effort put in by all."

The minister said while it takes 5-10 years to test and develop vaccines, India has researched and developed an in-house vaccine, and to add to the complex manufacturing, the humongous logistics involving setting up cold chains, airport transfers, delivery to states, local storage and last-mile connectivity were set up in no time.

Kher, who has composed and sung the anthem, said it is essential to dispel myths and rumours surrounding vaccines and promote its usage so as to

ensure all get the vaccine.

"We will be better equipped to deal with (a new challenge) both in terms of infrastructure and medical science" but "we should not declare victory yet," Oil Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said adding that vaccination has now become a people's movement despite the negative narrative and falsehood spread by some in the country.

India has recorded 15,981 Covid-19 cases in a day, taking the infection tally to 3,40,53,573 while 166 more fatalities pushed the death toll to 4,51,980, according to the Union Health Ministry's data on Saturday. The number of active Covid

cases has declined to 2,01,632, the lowest in 218 days. The national recovery rate was at 98.07 per cent, the data updated at 8 am showed.

India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20-lakh mark on August 7, 2020, 30 lakh on August 23, 40 lakh on September 5 and 50 lakh on September 16. It went past 60 lakh on September 28, 70 lakh on October 11, crossed 80 lakh on October 29, 90 lakh on November 20 and surpassed the one-crore mark on December 19.

India crossed the grim milestone of two crore on May 4 and three crore on June 23.



# ISIS claims Shia mosque bombing in Afghanistan

The Islamic State group claimed responsibility for a deadly suicide bombing on a Shia mosque in southern Afghanistan that killed 47 people and wounded scores more. Relatives laid the bodies of the victims to rest on Saturday and called on the Taliban to protect them.

ISIS said in a statement posted late on Friday on social media that two of the group's members shot and killed security guards manning the entrance of the Fatimiya mosque in Kandahar province.

One detonated his explosives at the entrance of the mosque and the other inside.

ISIS's news agency *Amaq* in a statement gave the names of the attackers as Anas al-Khurasani and Abu Ali al-Baluchi, both Afghan nationals.

The families of the victims Saturday dug their graves and carried the bodies to their final resting place. In total, 63 graves were dug, but the Taliban's chief for the provincial department of culture and information maintained the official death toll was 47.

"There are so many who have lost body parts, and among those in hospital in serious condition, I don't know how many more numbers will

be added to the death toll," said community elder Hajji Farhad.

Shiite leader Sayed Mohammed Agha called on the Taliban Government to take serious measures to protect the Shia minority, "because our enemies will harm our society by any means they can."

The attack came a week after a bombing claimed by the local Islamic State affiliate killed 46 people at a Shia mosque in northern Afghanistan, raising fears that ISIS — an enemy of both the Taliban and the West — is expanding its foothold in Afghanistan.

Friday's attack was the deadliest to strike Afghanistan since the dramatic US exit

from the country, which allowed the Taliban to seize control of the Afghan capital. It was also the first major attack by the group in the country's south.

ISIS carries out frequent attacks in its eastern stronghold, but recently has shown signs of expansion, with attacks in the north and Kabul.

The attacks have brought into question the Taliban's ability to counter the growing ISIS threat. The Taliban have pledged to restore peace and security after decades of war and have also given the US assurances that they will not allow the country to be used as a base for launching extremist attacks on other countries.

# America vows to pay relatives of Afghans killed in drone strike

The US Defense Department said on Friday that it is committed to offering condolence payments to relatives of the 10 people who were killed in an errant US drone strike in Kabul, Afghanistan, in August.

Pentagon spokesman John Kirby said in a statement that the Defense Department was also working with the State Department to help surviving family members relocate to the United States.

Kirby said the matter arose in a meeting Thursday between Dr. Colin Kahl, under secretary of defense for policy, and Dr. Steven Kwon, founder and president of the nonprofit group Nutrition & Education International.

"Dr. Kahl reiterated Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin's commitment to the families, including offering ex gratia condolence payments," Kirby said. He did not say how much money would be offered.

On August 29, a US Hellfire missile struck a car driven by Zemerai Ahmadi, who had just pulled into the driveway of the Ahmadi family compound. In all, 10 members of the family, including seven children, were killed in the strike.

Weeks later, Marine Gen. Frank McKenzie, head of U.S.

Central Command, called the strike a "tragic mistake" and said innocent civilians were indeed killed in the attack.

During the meeting Thursday, Kwon told Kahl that Ahmadi had worked with NEI for many years, "providing care and lifesaving assistance for people facing high mortality rates in Afghanistan," according to Kirby.

The U.S. military initially defended the strike, saying it had targeted an Islamic State group's "facilitator" and disrupted the militants' ability to carry out attacks during the chaotic final stage of the withdrawal of US and NATO troops from Afghanistan.

Discrepancies between the military's portrayal of the strike and findings on the ground quickly emerged. *The Associated Press* and other news organizations reported that the driver of the targeted vehicle was a longtime employee at a US humanitarian organisation. There were no signs of a large secondary blast, despite the Pentagon's assertion that the vehicle contained explosives.

The drone strike followed a devastating suicide bombing by an Islamic State offshoot that killed 169 Afghans and 13 US military personnel at one of the gates to the Kabul airport in late August.

# UN official: Taliban to announce secondary school for girls

A senior UN official said on Friday the Taliban told him they will announce "very soon" that all Afghan girls will be allowed to attend secondary schools.

UNICEF Deputy Executive Director Omar Abdi, who visited Kabul last week, told reporters at UN headquarters that five of Afghanistan's 34 provinces — Balkh, Jawzjan and Samangan in the northwest, Kunduz in the northeast and Urozgan in the southwest — are already allowing girls to attend secondary school.

He said the Taliban's education minister told him they are working on "a framework" to allow all girls to continue their schooling beyond the sixth grade, which should be published "between a month and two."

"As I speak to you today, millions of girls of secondary school age are missing out on education for the 27th consecutive day," Abdi said. "We are urging them not to wait. Any day that we wait — it's a day lost for those girls that are out of school."

During the Taliban's previous rule of Afghanistan from

1996-2001, they denied girls and women the right to education and barred them from working and public life. Since their August 15 takeover of Afghanistan as US and NATO forces were in the final stages of their chaotic withdrawal from the country after 20 years, the Taliban have come under increasing international pressure to ensure women's rights to education and work.

Abdi said that in every meeting he pressed the Taliban "to let girls resume their learning," calling it "critical for the girls themselves and for the country as a whole."

When the Taliban were ousted from power in 2001 by a US-led coalition for harboring Osama bin Laden who masterminded the 9/11 attacks on the United States, only one million Afghan children were in school at all levels, he said.

Over the past 20 years, that figure rose to almost 10 million children at all levels, including 4 million girls, Abdi said, and in the last decade the number of schools tripled from 6,000 to 18,000.

"Education gains of the past two decades must be strengthened and not rolled back," he said.

# Scotland Yard probes Islamist terror link to British MP's fatal stabbing

Scotland Yard on Saturday said the killing of Conservative MP David Amess is being treated as a terrorist attack and it was probing a potential Islamist terrorism link to the fatal stabbing, an incident that has shocked the country and prompted calls for a review of security measures for lawmakers engaged in constituency work.

Amess, 69 and a member of British Prime Minister Boris Johnson's ruling Conservative Party, died after being stabbed several times on Friday as he was meeting his constituents in at Belfairs Methodist Church in Leigh-on-Sea, Essex.

A 25-year-old British man, believed to be of Somali heritage, was arrested at the scene on suspicion of murder and remains in custody at a police station in Essex, south-east England. Prime Minister Boris Johnson and Opposition Labour leader Sir Keir Starmer laid flowers at the scene of the stabbing, together on Saturday morning.

"Senior National Coordinator for Counter Terrorism Policing, Deputy Assistant Commissioner Dean Haydon formally declared the incident as terrorism. The early investigation has revealed a potential motivation linked to Islamist extremism," the

Metropolitan Police said in a statement.

"A 25-year-old British man was arrested at the scene on suspicion of murder. He is currently in custody at a police station in Essex. As part of the investigation, officers are currently carrying out searches at

two addresses in the London area and these are ongoing," it said.

"It is believed that he acted alone, and we are not seeking anyone else in connection with the incident at this time. However, enquiries into the circumstances continue," it added.

# ASEAN downgrades Myanmar presence at summit

Myanmar junta chief excluded

Southeast Asian Foreign Ministers have agreed to downgrade Myanmar's participation in an upcoming summit in their sharpest rebuke yet of its leaders following a February 1 military takeover.

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations will invite a non-political representative instead of Myanmar's military leader, Senior Gen. Min Aung Hlaing, the grouping's chair Brunei said on Saturday.

The decision was made at an emergency meeting late Friday after Myanmar refused to cooperate with the bloc's crisis envoy, Erywan Yusof, who is Brunei's Second Foreign Minister.

In a swift response, Myanmar's foreign ministry said it was "extremely disappointed and strongly objected" to the group's decision, which was made without a consensus.

"Linking the matter of Myanmar's representation at



the ASEAN summit with the visit of the special envoy would be counterproductive as it is merely putting pressure on Myanmar," the statement said.

It also claimed that the military junta's current government was in line with Myanmar's constitution.

The 10-member bloc has been under intense international pressure to do more to force member state Myanmar to free scores of political figures, including ousted civilian leader Aung San Suu Kyi, as

well as halt the violence that has left more than 1,100 civilians dead. ASEAN's envoy abruptly canceled a trip to Myanmar this week after he was told he would not be able to meet with Suu Kyi, and others as he wanted. Myanmar contended Erywan could not meet with people facing legal proceedings such as Suu Kyi and deposed President Win Myint, Brunei said in a statement.

Suu Kyi and other top civilian leaders were detained in the army takeover. She faces various charges that her supporters and independent analysts say are an attempt to legitimize the military action.

The statement from Brunei said the ASEAN ministers were concerned about the impact of the Myanmar crisis on regional security and about the "unity, credibility and centrality of ASEAN as a rules-based organization." The bloc's envoy must have access to all concerned parties, it said.

Members of the political opposition's National Unity Government, which views itself as a shadow government, have asked to attend the October 26-28 summit, it said.

## GLOBE TROTTING

**NEPAL RECORDS MASSIVE DIP IN NEW COVID CASES**  
**Kathmandu:** Nepal reported 136 new COVID-19 cases in the past 24 hours, a record low in comparison to the last few months, taking the national tally to 804,652 cases, the health ministry said on Wednesday. There are 12,598 active Covid cases across the country. During the last 24 hours, 845 people recovered from the disease.

**MOU WITH BHUTAN TO SPEED UP TALKS: CHINA Beijing:** China has said that its MoU with Bhutan firming up a three-step roadmap for expediting the boundary negotiations will make a "meaningful contribution" to speed up the border talks and establishment of diplomatic ties with Thimphu. The two countries on October 14 signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for Expediting the China-Bhutan Boundary Negotiation in Beijing and Thimphu via video link.

**ERDOGAN BIDS FAREWELL TO MERKEL AFTER 16 YRS**



**Istanbul:** Angela Merkel's final visit to Turkey as German chancellor on Saturday saw two of Europe's longest serving leaders pay tribute to one another as Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan hosted her for farewell talks overlooking the Bosphorus. Erdogan had been in office for more than two years when Merkel came to power in 2005. Since then, they have built a relationship based on pragmatism that has weathered several crises.

**OVER 90 SNAKES FOUND UNDER CALIFORNIA HOME San Francisco (US):** Al Wolf is used to clearing one or two snakes from under houses but recently was called by a woman who said she had seen rattlesnakes scurry under her Northern California house and was surprised to find more than 90 rattlesnakes getting ready to hibernate.

**4 TOURISTS FOUND DEAD AT ALBANIA BEACH RESORT Tirana (Albania):** Police say four Russian tourists were found dead at a beach resort in western Albania. Albanian police issued a statement Saturday saying the four were found asphyxiated in a hotel sauna in the village of Qerret.

**11 KIDS DROWNED IN INDONESIAN RIVER Jakarta:** Eleven students drowned and 10 others were rescued during a school outing for a river cleanup in Indonesia's West Java Province.

### HINDU'S BODY FOUND; B'DESH DURGA PUJA ...

According to a Hindu community leader, the deceased was a victim of bigot attacks on devotees on Friday.

Four people were killed and scores of others injured during clashes between Muslim bigots and the police at Hajiganj sub-district in central Chandpur on Wednesday and Thursday, prompting the government to call out paramilitary forces to maintain law and order across the country. On Thursday, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina promised to bring to justice the culprits behind the violence, saying anyone involved in the attacks on Hindu temples and Durga Puja venues in Comilla will not be spared. "The incidents in Comilla are being thoroughly investigated. Nobody will be spared. It doesn't matter which religion they belong to. They will be hunted down and punished," she said while exchanging greetings with the Hindu community members during an event at Dhakeshwari National Temple in Dhaka on the occasion of Durga Puja.

The violence had erupted after an alleged blasphemy incident at a Durga Puja pavilion in Cumilla, bordering Chandpur and about 100 kms from Dhaka, after which a probe was launched.

### 30% DEPRIVED OF WATER, SOAP AT HOME!

"Global response efforts to the pandemic have created an unprecedented time for hand hygiene. Yet progress remains far too slow for the most vulnerable, underserved communities," Unicef WASH Director Kelly Ann Naylor was quoted as saying in a statement. "Hand hygiene cannot be viewed as a temporary provision to manage Covid-19. Further long-term investment in water, sanitation and hygiene can help prevent the next health crisis from coming. It also means fewer people falling

ill with respiratory infections, fewer children dying from diarrhoea diseases, and more pregnant mothers and newborns protected from preventable conditions like sepsis."

### SIX PEOPLE DEAD...

"The situation is serious", Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan said. He, however, said the latest weather forecast indicates that the situation is not going to get worse. Officials said personnel of the Army, Airforce and the Navy were on the way to Koottickal and Peruvanthanam-- the two hilly villages falling under Kottayam and Idukki districts respectively--where an overflowing river swept through houses, displacing and isolating many. State Cooperation Minister VN Vasavan, who reached the neighbourhood of these landslide-hit villages, said bodies of two women and a child who died, were recovered while search was on to recover the body of a man who also lost his life in the incident. He said at least 12 people are missing from these villages.

In a separate rain related incident, a man and a woman--both 30-years-old--died as their car was swept away in the flood waters in Kanjar in Idukki district, police said. Their bodies have been recovered, they said.

According to a defence spokesperson, Mi-17 and Sarang Helicopters are already in standby mode to meet the requirements but they could not start operations as the weather at Kottayam is still bad. Air Force assets are still at Sular in a standby mode, she said.

### NIHANG SIKH SURRENDERS FOR...

A senior police official of Sonepat police said while seeking Sarabjit's custody, police submitted before the court that they have to make certain recoveries from the

accused arrested in the case. The official said Sarabjit has named four more people during interrogations while pointing to their involvement in the incident.

"We produced Sarabjit before the court. The accused has been remanded in seven days' police custody by the court," Sonepat's Deputy Superintendent of Police, Virender Singh said. "The accused has pointed to the involvement of four more people in the case and taken their names...we are conducting further investigations in this regard. We have to make some recoveries from the arrested accused, including the weapon used in the crime and the clothes he was wearing," he said. The total number of accused in the crime could be more than five, the DSP said, adding further investigations were on.

Hours after the macabre crime on Friday, a man wearing the blue robes of the Sikhs' Nihang order appeared before the media, claiming that he had "punished" the victim for "desecrating" a Sikh holy book. Other Nihangs had claimed he had "surrendered" to police, while police had later said Sarabjit Singh, who hails from Gurdaspur district, has been arrested in the case. Earlier on Friday, in a video clip that surfaced on social media, some Nihangs were seen standing around the injured man with his severed left hand close to his head. The group was heard accusing him of desecrating a Sikh holy book.

The video showed the Nihang group asking the badly injured man, who is pleading with them in Punjabi, where he had come from and who sent him.

### I'M FULL-TIME, HANDS-ON...

"Above all, it requires self-control and discipline," she said amidst the demand from senior leaders like AK Antony as well as Chief Ministers of Punjab, Rajasthan, and Chhattisgarh to bring back Rahul as the chief of the grand old party.

News agency ANI, quoting sources said that on the insistence of senior leaders at the CWC meeting, Rahul said that he "will consider" becoming the party president again.

The CWC decided that elections for the top post will be held between August 21 and September 20 next year and the next chief could take the baton by October 2022. It emerged during the course of the discussion that there should not be any immediate changes in top leadership due to the impending crucial Assembly elections, including that of Uttar Pradesh and Punjab next year. After a nearly five-hour-long meeting of the CWC, AICC general secretary (organisation) K C Venugopal announced the election schedule, which includes a massive membership drive for the polls starting from November 1, 2021, and will go on till March 31, 2022.

At a Press conference, Venugopal also stated that the election of PCC presidents, vice presidents, treasurers, PCC executives, and AICC members by the PCC general body will be held between July 21 and August 20, 2022. The election of the Congress president will be held between August 21 and September 20, 2022, he said.

Speaking at the press conference Congress chief spokesperson Randeep Surjewala said all members of the CWC have reassured their full faith in Sonia and her leadership. On being asked whether Rahul can become the party's president before the organisational elections, Surjewala said, "The dates have been already announced, any changes that take place will happen accordingly."

"There is no need to speak to me through the media. So let us all have a free and honest discussion. But what should get communicated outside the four walls of this room is the collective decision of the CWC," Sonia noted in her opening remarks.

Talking about the party's revival, a key theme raised by the G-23, she said, "The entire organisation wants a revival of the Congress. But this requires unity and keeping the party's interests paramount. Above

all, it requires self-control and discipline. "Never have we let issues of public importance and concern go unaddressed. You are aware that I have been taking them up with the Prime Minister as have Dr Manmohan Singh and Rahul ji. I have been interacting with like-minded political parties regularly. We have issued joint statements on national issues and coordinated our strategy in Parliament as well."

The CWC also passed three resolutions, including a political calling upon all democratic parties and forces to join hands to resolutely oppose the Modi Government in order to protect the values on which our country was founded and to advance the causes of the people.

Sonia also spoke about the Lakhimpur Kheri incident, the farmers' agitation, inflation, foreign policy and the continuing border stand-off with China, targeted killing in Jammu and Kashmir and the disinvestment process. One of the resolutions was on agrarian distress and the CWC mentioned, "We reiterate our continued resolve to fight the battle alongside the farmers and farm labourers to defeat the Modi Government's deliberate attack on India's Annadats." The CWC also urged the Centre to 'take immediate steps to reduce prices' as part of a resolution on inflation during the meeting. Regarding the same, the Opposition party also announced to undertake mass agitation on price rise between Nov 14 and 29.

"All supporters and leaders will take up padyatras to polling booths. This will be followed by small meetings," said Venugopal.

### 2 MORE MARTYRED...

"On October 14, 2021 after a fierce firefight with terrorists, the communication with Subedar Ajay Singh and Naik Harendra Singh was disrupted. Relentless operations continued to neutralise the terrorists and to re-establish communication with the soldiers. Subedar Ajay Singh and Naik Harendra Singh were killed in action

in the fierce fight and their bodies have been recovered in the evening of 16 Oct 21," he added.

Subedar Ajay Singh is a resident of village - Rampur, Post- Jajal, Tehsil- Narendra Nagar, District - Tehri, Uttarakhand.

Naik Harendra Singh is a native of village - Pipalsari, Post- Rikhnikhil, Tehsil- Lansdowne, District - Pauri, Uttarakhand. To prevent further loss of lives of the Indian Army jawans, the elite para commandos have directed to neutralise the group of terrorists hiding in the thickly forested area. The elite commandos were earlier inducted into the operations keeping in mind the difficult terrain and thick foliage.

After a brief lull since last evening, fresh contact was established with the terrorists on Saturday. The exchange of fire also took place for some time, but the terrorists continued to remain at large even on the sixth day of the operations.

Deputy Inspector General (Rajouri Poonch range) Vivek Gupta told reporters in Poonch that the counter terrorist operation is going on in the thickly forested area of Mendhar tehsil in Poonch. He said the joint grid of the security forces was tracking the terrorists in the area for over two months now. "So far the security forces have established contact with the terrorists on three occasions," said Vivek Gupta, adding, "We have managed to hold these terrorists in a particular area and following all the SoP's in order to neutralise these terrorists as soon as possible." He said the traffic in the area has been diverted to ensure safety of the commuters.

Meanwhile, after the targeted killings of civilians in different parts of Kashmir valley the security forces have adopted an aggressive posturing. Since October 8, 13 terrorists have been neutralised in nine encounters.

Hitting back, terrorists shot dead two non-locals labourers, hailing from Hindi heartland states of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh were shot dead in Srinagar and Pulwama districts late Saturday evening .

# Heart in right place

There are some films which have a great storyline and the makers choose a fantastic subject. The star cast is strong as well, yet there is something missing that refuse to resonate and make it a movie that is par excellence. Rashmi fits this category.

Directed by Akarsh Khurana and produced by Ronnie Screwvala, Neha Anand and Pranjal Khandhaya, the film has heart in the right place. However, what is missing is the soul that puts life into a subject that is sensitive and talks about gender testing for women athletes globally – a subject that has been in debate for years.

Taapsee Pannu, who has done movies like Pink, Badla and Thappad, despite remaining the driving force behind Rashmi Rocket looks totally helpless in the second half of the movie. This is a bit strange since she has shown to be a woman who is strong minded and definitely not someone who will bow down to anybody let alone a bunch of women athletes out to get her. Of course, there is a scene where she hits out but that does nothing to give the impression that she is in any ways the girl that

she was at the start of the movie.

And this is where Rashmi Rocket falters. It is strange to see such a U-turn in a character – from a woman who dominates to a woman who is helpless – doesn't fit with her persona and how she was brought up. Then there are other things that don't fit. Take the Bhuj earthquake that finds its way in the film. The 2001 earthquake on January 26 killed more than 20,000 people and injured over 1.5 lakh people is shown in a blasé manner. While it has no bearing on the film or the subject, a two second shot of cracked earth takes away the devastation it left.

But not all is lost. There are some parts of the movie that are truly inspiring – Taapsee Pannu's need to fight against the injustice meted out to her. The strong family backing that she has – from her mother played by Supriya Pathak and husband played by Priyanshu Painyuli. Both have done a great job here. Mohan Joshi does his bit too even if his screen presence is for 10 minutes.

It is Abhishek Banerjee who needs a special mention here. He plays a funny part serious lawyer with great aplomb. His blundering, at the start, are endearing like where he addresses the judge as ma'am instead of Your Honor. If you are a Taapsee Pannu fan, you will like this.

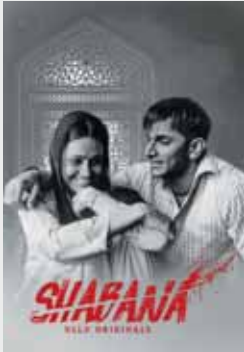

# 'Daily soaps are all about how you live on a day-to-day basis'

**NARENDRA GUPTA** who plays Newton Chattopadhyay in &TV's *Mauka-E-Vardaat – Operation Vijay* talks to **SUPRIYA RAMESH** about his character, why he agreed to the role and how much work goes into playing a crime genre

**■What is Mauka-E-Vardaat – Operation Vijay about?**

It is self defining. A band of Indian officers detect a crime and try to nab culprits and they do it successfully. I play the role of a scientist, who is the brains and helps the Indian officers. He draws conclusions from the past and present to guide and help the officers.

**■ Tell us about your role?**

Its a very different role. I play a scientist who lives away from reach. Nobody knows my whereabouts and contact information. But the main character Newton Chattopadhyay knows everything and keeps track of everything. While doing so if something goes south, he appears suddenly and guides people. He is an expert who doesn't get himself involved but is always on standby. He is like a father figure, professor, friend, scientist. He is the amalgamation of everything, every emotion.

**■What made you say yes to this role?**

I agreed to this role because this character is with them and still not with them. When I'm shooting, I'm at my den and from there itself I'm explaining things to other characters and that too without seeing them. It's a different type of challenge. Most times in acting, there is another artist with whom you give and take dialogues. I react to these dialogues on the fly and it is pretty challenging. There are certain instances where I suddenly appear somewhere and then disappear from there after finishing my dialogue. Very knowledgeable, it is a character that I haven't portrayed so I have accepted it and I'm enjoying while finding it interesting. I'm sure.

**■What does 'Aalokik Shaktiyan' mean here?**

Aalokik shaktiya refers to the powers that are beyond our regular scientific reach and understand. "Lok" means people and "loki" means where people are from.



"Aalokik" means something that isn't from where people live. For example, superhuman capabilities. The spiritual powered that aren't discovered yet but loosely based on scientific terms. The main agonist and antagonist keep finding new powers like these. To produce these thoughts realistically, is very challenging because it's beyond our imagination.

The antagonist has these "aalokik shaktiya" but the protagonists use their cunning and the current superior technology to equalize the situation. They don't have the luxury of exemplary powers but they have their courage, Braun and attitude to change the tides.

**■You have mostly been a part of the crime genre be it series or a movie. What are the challenges?**

Daily soaps are all about

how you live on a day to day basis and react accordingly. Whereas in crime shows, you have to take care of a specific story, crime and genre. You have to showcase your emotions differently and have a realistic approach about the detection of the crime. It's different because of the increase in intuitiveness and overall information.

**■We understand that you have also worked in Bollywood movies. How is the work environment different?**

For an actor, working in films or working in television or any media is the same. But there are certain limitations and aspects with acting in every media. If you talk about acting in films, there is no limitation in the sense of time constraint. The same can't be said about acting in television because every episode has one.

You have to edit it and telecast it in planned schedules. It's a good challenge as there is less time for relaxation. You're always shooting on time and procrastinating has no place here no matter what. The channel cannot go blank on that day.

**■How was shooting in a pandemic different?**

In the pandemic, there are not many people on set that used to be. There are many protocols in place that prohibit the interaction of multiple people together. The workload has increased but as many actors take initiative and do some things themselves. We have to help each other and share responsibilities. There is no crowding and audiences because of these important restrictions. We all are very happy that we are able to work while keeping each other safe by following these rules.





# THE DEATH STING

At present, Delhi is witnessing a rise in Dengue patients, reporting the maximum number of cases since 2018 due to prolonged monsoon. SUPRIYA RAMESH talks to experts to know more

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), Dengue cases have grown dramatically around the world in recent decades. A vast majority of cases are asymptomatic or mild and self-managed, and hence the actual numbers of Dengue cases are under-reported. Many cases are also misdiagnosed as other febrile illnesses.

With the advent of the rainy season, we surely get some respite from the scorching summer heat but many water-borne diseases tag along. And one of the most common diseases is Dengue, a mosquito-borne viral infection that is common in warm, tropical climates. It is caused by any one of four closely related antigenically distinct groups called serotypes that are DENV-1, DENV-2, DENV-3 and DENV-4, which means that it is possible to be infected four times in a lifetime. A particular serotype can be predominant at different times in a geographical area. It gives space to a wide number of symptoms that can be extremely mild (unnoticeable) to extremely severe. In severe cases, it can also be fatal.

Currently, Delhi is witnessing a surge in cases, reporting the maximum number of cases since 2018 for the same period due to prolonged monsoon. Whereas Punjab which observed 8,400 cases last year has reported only 5,889 cases this year, Hoshiarpur topping the list with 933 cases.

While many Dengue infections cause only mild illness, there have been cases where it has also caused an acute flu-like illness. Over time, this forms into a potentially lethal complication, called severe Dengue. WHO states that severe Dengue is a leading cause of serious illness and death in some Asian and Latin American countries and requires management by medical professionals.

As per a comparative study published in Clinical Infectious Diseases, the incidence of Dengue has grown dramatically around the world in recent decades. A vast majority of cases are asymptomatic or mild and self-managed, and hence the actual numbers of Dengue cases are under-reported. Many cases are also misdiagnosed as other febrile illnesses.

The number of Dengue cases reported to WHO increased eight times over the last two decades, from 505,430 cases in 2000 to over 2.4 million in 2010, and 5.2 million in 2019. Reported deaths between the years 2000 and 2015 increased from 960 to 4032.

But why are we talking about DENV-2 at the moment? Is it more severe than all other serotypes? How worried should we be? These are the questions our mind is flooded with and it is high time we all should understand the seriousness of the disease and keep an ear to the ground.

The DENV-2 or D2 variant of

Dengue was struck many cases of fever and deaths in western UP districts of Firozabad, Agra, Mathura and Aligarh. The term severe Dengue is in circulation now. It was earlier known as Dengue haemorrhagic fever and Dengue shock syndrome.

The new variant has been observed in 11 states and has become a topic of discussion amongst medical experts and organisations. "With DENV-2 type there seems to be a higher incidence of Dengue hemorrhagic fever where there is a capillary leak and bleed with low platelets and it may eventually progress to Dengue shock syndrome where blood pressure drops," Dr Dilip Gude, Sr Consultant Physician, Yashoda Hospitals Hyderabad tells you.

"A person previously infected with Dengue when gets infected with a different serotype has a higher chance of developing hemorrhagic fever or shock syndrome," tells Dr Anurag Aggarwal, Consultant Internal Medicine, QRG Super Speciality Hospital.

With all the talk about mosquitoes increasing during the rainy season, it is equally important to know that mosquitoes are also mainly attracted to carbon dioxide and heat, which indicates that they are equally active during summer. Moreover, DENV has the potential to infect people all year round and with this, the risk and fear remain throughout. Dr Anurag tells you more about the factors responsible for mosquito-spread. "Lack of adequate drainage, open drains and open areas of water stagnation are factors responsible for rapid spread. Increased movement of people without the adequate coverage of the body with exposed arms and legs increases their risk of getting bitten by an infected mosquito, wherein one in four people infected with Dengue virus will develop the disease."

Talking about the symptoms, they can develop four to 10 days after the mosquito bites and last anywhere from two to seven days. We might be aware of only the common, usually talked about symptoms like high fever, severe body pain and internal bleeding with falling platelets but Dr Aggarwal gives a detailed note on the same. "High-grade fever with chills, backache, abdominal pain, rash, vomiting, joint pains, muscle aches, generalised weakness and fatigue and in severe cases shock, hemorrhagic manifestation like vomiting out blood, bleeding from anus, nose, gums and blood in the urine."

He further adds that when a patient is having severe abdominal pain, recurrent vomiting and increased irritability, it may indicate the patient is developing severe Dengue. The intensity of fever has no correlation with the severity of illness a patient develops in the following days of illness.

In case one is facing possible symptoms and is sceptical about the testing, all

you need to know is that there are two ways to get yourself tested, a card test and ELISA. Dr Aggarwal elaborates. "Testing is done by blood. One is through the card test which is not as sensitive as another test called ELISA. Two types of antigens are of significance, NS1 which is usually detectable within 24 hrs of symptom onset and may remain positive until nine days and other is IgM which is usually detectable four to five days after symptom onset and remains positive up to 12 weeks after catching an infection or maybe even longer."

More than 20,000 confirmed Dengue cases across the country have been reported with more than 220 deaths occurring only in Uttar Pradesh. Cases have been reported from Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, MP, Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, and Telangana.

There are no vaccines and currently, the treatment of Dengue is through supportive care and no specific medication is available. "The management includes intravenous fluid therapy, monitoring of the clinical condition, and intensive care. This helps reduce the morbidity and mortality in Dengue fever complications. Mild and uncomplicated cases can be managed at home under the supervision of the doctor," Dr Anjali Saxena, Senior Consultant, General Pediatrics tells you.

Moreover, WHO has advised that patients should seek medical advice, rest and drink plenty of fluids. Paracetamol can be taken to bring down fever and reduce joint pains. However, aspirin or ibuprofen should not be taken since they can increase the risk of bleeding.

We can say that the Dengue outbreak is still under control but it has led to a surge in cases of high fever countrywide. As it is known to cause more morbidity than other variants, patients are having high-grade fever. Dr Gude tells you that

● Diseases that are spread to people by mosquitoes include Zika virus, West Nile virus, Chikungunya virus, yellow fever and malaria.

● Zika fever, also known as Zika virus disease or simply Zika, is a mosquito-borne disease caused by the Zika virus. In many cases, there are no symptoms, but it can present in a similar way to dengue fever.

● Yellow fever is a viral disease of typically short duration. However, approximately 30,000 people around the world die from yellow fever every year.

● Chikungunya is a viral disease transmitted to humans via infected mosquitoes. Symptoms typically include fever, joint pain, headache, muscle pain, joint swelling and rash.

there is an epidemiological hypothesis that there is a four-year cyclical spurt for Dengue outbreaks and DENV-2 serotype now is known to cause a much-complicated disease.

With this, he advises that early diagnosis, aggressive hydration, and admitting high-risk groups such as the elderly and children and immunosuppressed patients may be important.

Considering the pandemic, how worried should we be about the Dengue virus? Are there chances that it could worsen amidst the pandemic? These are again a few questions that might cross our minds. Early symptoms of both COVID and Dengue can be the same and it would be nearly impossible for a common man to self detect if he/she has been infected

by corona or Dengue. And coinfections are common and if someone gets COVID and Dengue then the outcome is going to be deadly.

"In this pandemic background, one needs to be extra careful and take all necessary precautions to prevent mosquito-borne diseases," Dr Gude tells you.

Dr Saxena tells you that during these times healthcare resources can get overwhelmed and this can be detrimental to providing medical care to the needy.

Your safety is in your hands and making sure that you are not giving a breeding ground to mosquitoes is your responsibility. Keep the surroundings of your house as dry as possible with no scope for stagnant water, cover your body with full sleeves clothes, put on mosquito repellent creams, coils, nets. Dr Gude suggests that having a high index of suspicion and taking a clinician's help as early as possible is important.

"Do not allow water to stagnate, cover drains or sprinkle oil over stagnated water, empty pots/tyres of water in your house, wear full sleeves clothes when stepping outside the house," Dr Aggarwal tells you.

He further adds that in case of fever, visit your nearest physician as soon as possible. Watch for symptoms like intense abdominal pain, bleeding from any site, restlessness and breathlessness when you need to be concerned.

"The proximity of mosquito vector breeding sites to human habitation is a significant risk factor for Dengue as well as for other diseases that Aedes mosquito transmit. At present, the main method to control or prevent the transmission of Dengue virus is to combat the mosquito vectors," WHO advises and suggest ways through which it can be achieved.

◆**Prevention of mosquito breeding**  
Preventing mosquitoes from accessing egg-laying habitats by environmental management and modification

Applying appropriate insecticides to water storage outdoor containers

◆**Personal protection from mosquito bites**

Using of personal household protection measures, such as window screens, repellents, insecticide-treated materials, coils and vaporizer and wearing clothing that minimises skin exposure

◆**Community engagement**

Educating the community on the risks of mosquito-borne diseases

◆**Reactive vector control**  
Emergency vector control measures such as applying insecticides as space spraying during outbreaks may be used by health authorities

In addition, there is ongoing research amongst many groups of international collaborators in search of novel tools and innovative strategies that will contribute to global efforts to interrupt the transmission of Dengue, as well as other mosquito-borne diseases.

## MYTHBUSTER

### You cannot get dengue fever twice

The dengue virus (DENV) known to cause dengue fever has four different but related serotypes, DENV-1, DENV-2, DENV-3 AND DENV4. When a person recovers from their first infection, they gain lifetime immunity from this single serotype only. Contracting the disease from the other three dengue types is still possible, with each subsequent infection potentially more severe than its predecessor.

### Dengue is contagious

Dengue is transmitted to humans when an infected female mosquito bites, mainly the Aedes aegypti mosquito. A person cannot contract the virus through an infected person if he or she sneezes or coughs. Moreover, cases of DENV transmission through blood transfusion or organ transplantation are also rare.

### An infected mosquito breeds only in dirty stagnant water

An Aedes aegypti mosquito may not necessarily lay eggs only in dirty water, it can do it in clean stagnant water too. It is important to drain or to keep the containers and surfaces around the house like basins, pots, jars and rain gutters firmly closed with a lid at all times.

### Dengue fever is only prevalent during the rainy season

The sole reason why people believe this myth that dengue fever is more during the rainy season is because the Aedes aegypti lay eggs in water so it is natural to relate to it. Mosquitoes are also attracted to carbon dioxide and heat, which suggests that they are just as active during summer.

### Your body may heal itself naturally from dengue fever

A person might suffer from dengue fever for a week with severe headaches, vomiting, and bone and muscle pain. People might have the ability to recover without getting hospitalised but they cannot recover without proper rest, hydration and painkillers. The disease might evolve into severe dengue if self-managed.







# Cars with lower running costs likely to gain higher traction among buyers: Report

**New Delhi:** With fuel prices going up by 35 per cent over the past 15 months thereby impacting overall vehicle running costs, cars that have higher fuel efficiency and lower maintenance costs are expected to gain higher traction among buyers in India, specially in the sub-Rs 10 lakh category, according to a report.

Considering the fact that 70 per cent of the passenger vehicles market in India is still accounted for by vehicles costing less than Rs 10 lakh, the development augurs well for market leader Maruti Suzuki India Ltd (MSIL), said the report by HSBC Global Research.



"Over the past 15 months, fuel prices have gone up 35 per cent, impacting overall vehicle running costs...Our channel interactions suggest that customers are increasingly becoming

considerate of the recent rise in fuel prices," it said.

Citing the example of Maruti Suzuki's Swift petrol, the report said for a compact passenger vehicle fuel now accounts for around 40 per cent of the vehicle's life-time cost compared with 30 per cent in mid-2020.

"In the current environment, we believe cars that have higher fuel efficiency and lower maintenance costs should gain relatively higher traction among buyers, especially in the less than Rs 10 lakh category, which is still 70 per cent of the market in India," it said.

Stating that MSIL continues to score well in that regard,

HSBC Global Research said, "In our analysis, both in absolute terms and relative to competition, MSIL remains the market leader in fuel efficiency and total cost of ownership (COO)."

MSIL's competitive positioning should remain compelling given the fact that it has around 65 per cent market share in the less-than-Rs 10 lakh price category, it added.

The report also pointed out that MSIL's fuel efficiency has improved by 15-30 per cent in the past 10 years, citing the examples of fuel efficiency of Swift/Swift Dzire, which was 18 km per litre (kmpl) nearly 10 years back to 23.3 kmpl. **PTI**

# IMF hails India's 'swift and substantial' response to Covid crisis

**Washington:** Describing the Indian government's response to the Covid-19 situation as "swift and substantial", the International Monetary Fund (IMF) has said the country continued with labour reforms and privatisation despite the pandemic.

The IMF in its report based on "consultations" among members, however, sounded a note of caution saying that the economic outlook remains "clouded" due to pandemic-related uncertainties, contributing to both downside and upside risks.

In its "Article IV" consultations report, it further said that a persistent negative impact of COVID-19 on investment and other growth drivers could prolong the economic recovery.

On the Indian government's handling of the pandemic, the multilateral agency said it was "swift and substantial...Has included fiscal support, including scaled-up support to vulnerable groups, monetary policy easing, liquidity provision, and accommodative financial sector and regulatory policies".

"Despite the pandemic, the authorities have continued to introduce structural reforms, including labour reforms and a privatisation plan," the report said. The IMF has projected India's economic growth at 9.5 per cent in FY2021-22 and 8.5 per cent in 2022-23. Headline inflation is projected at 5.6 per cent in 2021-22, amid elevated price pressures.

"The economic outlook remains clouded due to pandemic-related uncertainties contributing to both downside and upside risks. A persistent negative impact of COVID-19 on investment, human capital, and other growth drivers could prolong the recovery and impact medium-term growth," the IMF said. It further said that while India benefits from favourable demographics, disruption to access to education and training due to the pandemic could weigh on improvements in human capital. At the same time, the recovery could also be faster than expected, it said adding that faster vaccination and better therapeutics could help contain the spread and limit the impact of the pandemic. **PTI**

# HDFC Bank's Q2 FY22 YoY net profit up 17.6%

**Mumbai:** Lender HDFC Bank on Saturday reported a year-on-year rise of 17.6 per cent in its net profit for Q2FY22. The bank's net profit increased to Rs 8,834.3 crore during the period under review over the quarter ended September 30, 2020.

Besides, the bank's net interest income (income earned less interest expended) rose 12.1 per cent from Rs 15,776.4 crore to Rs 17,684.4 crore for the corresponding quarter of the previous fiscal.

The lender's net revenues (net interest income plus other income) increased by 14.7 per cent, from Rs 21,868.8 crore to Rs 25,085.2 crore for the quarter ended September 30, 2020.

"Advances grew at 15.5 per cent reaching new heights driven through relationship management, digital offering and breadth of products. Core net interest margin was at 4.1 per cent. New liability relationships added during the quarter were at an all time high," HDFC Bank said in a statement. **IANs**

# Tatas plan to pilot synergy between airlines, post SPA

**New Delhi:** Conglomerate Tata Group plans to pilot synergy between all its airlines to compete in various market segments.

Post the SPA transaction, Tatas will have two full-service carriers — Vistara and Air India — along with two low-cost airlines — Air India Express and AirAsia India -- and a ground and cargo handling company, AISATS.

Accordingly, plans are afoot to run all these brands as independent entities under one vertical for sometime after the SPA. Nonetheless, the group intends to drive-in major synergies between the airlines in terms of fleet management, route deployment, flight timings and airport slot planning.

In terms of USPs, Vistara is expected to retain the premium services tag, while Air India will predominantly focus on key international and metro routes. The domestic feeder traffic is expected to be driven by AirAsia India which may get few aircraft from Air India's fleet. Furthermore, mergers will depend on profitability, performance and market situation apart from each airline's unique culture and suitability of brand. **IANs**

# SCO meet: India calls for special working group on start-ups

**New Delhi:** India has proposed creation of a new Special Working Group on Start-ups and Innovation at the SCO. The proposal was made by Minister of State for Commerce and Industry Anupriya Patel, in her intervention, at the 20th meeting of the SCO Ministers.

Stressing on the need for effective cooperation between the member states for a balanced and equitable growth in trade and commerce, Patel proposed the creation of a new Special Working Group on Start-ups and Innovation and for setting up a new Expert Working Group on Cooperation in Traditional Medicine.

"She also stated that cooperation in the field of start-ups and innovation can be a focal point in reviving our economies from the consequences of the pandemic," the Ministry of Commerce & Industry said in a statement. **IANs**

# India's forex reserves rise by over \$2 bn

**Mumbai:** India's foreign exchange reserves rose by \$2.039 billion during the week ended October 8.

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) forex reserves rose to \$639.516 billion from \$637.477 billion reported for the week ended October 1.

India's forex reserves comprise foreign currency assets (FCAs), gold reserves, SDRs, and the country's reserve position with the IMF. On a weekly basis, FCAs, the largest component of the forex reserves, edged higher by \$1.550 billion to \$577.001 billion. Similarly, the value of the country's gold reserves rose by \$464 million to \$38.022 billion. However, SDR value fell by \$28 million to \$19.268 billion. The country's reserve position with the IMF also fell by \$3 million to \$5.225 billion. **IANs**

# Court order to affect working capital of companies filing GST appeals

**New Delhi:** In what may affect the working capital of taxpayers looking at filing appeals against GST claims, it had now been held that anyone seeking remedy against indirect tax decision would have to make pre-deposit amount in cash and not by debiting electronic credit ledger.

Recently, the Division Bench of the Orissa High Court held that pre-deposit at the time of filing an appeal under section 107(6) of the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 (CGST Act) cannot be made by debiting the Electronic Credit Ledger (ECRL). The payment of pre-deposit should be


made by debiting the Electronic Cash Ledger (ECL) in accordance with section 49(3) of the CGST Act read with Rule 85(4) of the Central Goods and Services Tax Rules, 2017 (CGST Rules). What this order in effect does is that it puts the burden on taxpayers to pay the pre-deposit (ie 10 per cent of disputed

tax) amount in cash by transferring money from electronic cash ledger (ECL) for any tax dispute raised by them. This would mean more cash outflows leaving little for working capital needs. In case that went to the Orissa High Court, the revenue raised demands of GST along with interest on the petitioners, who

were engaged in execution of works contract. The petitioner filed an appeal and made payment towards pre-deposit (i.e. 10 per cent of disputed tax) for filing an appeal, by utilising the balance in the ECRL. The revenue dismissed the appeal and considered it to be defective, emphasising that the liability of pre-

deposit can be discharged only by debiting ECL.

The petitioner's contention was that any payment towards output tax can be made through ECRL. Since pre-deposit can be construed as a percentage of output tax, it can be paid by debiting ECRL. **IANs**

The singer who is back to judging and mentoring the Sa Re Ga Ma Pa Season 30 speaks with Shalini Saksena about how the calibre of the contestants has changed, challenges that come while judging and a song that is very close to his heart

‘I GET EXCITED BY HEARING VOICES THAT ARE NOT GENERIC’



■ What will we see in this season of Sa Re Ga Ma Pa?

The show has always stood for being an outstanding platform — for youngsters, musicians of the future and supremely talented singers from various genres, various voice textures and various backgrounds. It is going to be a very interesting show.

■ You have judged the show earlier as well. How has the calibre of candidates changed and evolved?

I am coming back to this show after almost nine years. You can make out that the youth of today realise the magnitude of the show. Probably nine years back, the level, where the show can reach and what can become of you was well understood and they work even harder now. They are well-prepared. They know that they have to make an impression the first time. So, they put in their heart and soul into music. The perfection, the talent and the way they present it is amazing. We have just finished the auditions and looks like a grand gala already.

■ What is the biggest challenge when it comes to judging?

The way we judge, what we look for is individuality. There are times when some voices try to impersonate another even when that original singer is there. I don't think this excites us as much as a voice that is a new species of flower — a voice that is unique. There is a contestant, whose voice has a texture that takes you back to the black and white era. She is a tiny little girl and she sounds like a Begum Akhtar or a Noor Jahan and that totally shocks you. I get excited by hearing voices that are not generic.

■ You also mentor. What do you tell them?

Lot of things actually. It is difficult to talk about technicalities in print. There are certain

things that they miss out on like breathing technique and pitching a note. There are ways to approach a single note — you can take the help of another note or pitch this note directly. This is difficult to explain in words. This is what we have to guide me in.

■ How has the music industry changed since you came?

Music industry is like the fashion industry. It is like food choice; how life is. The only constant in life is change. Things and tastes keep changing. Love for a particular genre comes up, some die down some stay longer. All this has got a soul — which is the melody, the arrangement, lyrics and the way you deliver the song. If these elements are strong, it is here to stay for a long time. Some of the artists are doing great job today and people are loving it.

■ You have done so many films, a project/song close to your heart?

It has to be *Breathless*. This is because it has given me the face and made me what I am today. When I look back at my journey of 30 years, there have been several milestones like *Mission Kashmir*, *Dil Chahata Hai* and *Bunty Aur Bunli*. There isn't a singer or composer who has not had some misses. Some songs survive even when the film tanked. I have seen a gamut of emotions in music. I have done different music over the years and enjoyed each one.

■ What next can we expect from you — this year?

There is lots of stuff happening. We just released *Toofan*. Then there is *Bunty Aur Bunli 2*, there is *Prithviraj*; these are two huge Yash Raj projects. There is *Yudhra* directed by Ravi Udayar that we are working on. Then we are working on Meghna Gulzar's biopic on Field Marshal Sam Manekshaw. We are working on Zoya's project. There are a lot of non-filmi collaborations as well. My academy is teaching classical music to people in 80 countries.

Virtual turns real

When the present pandemic hit last year, everything went online including concerts that brought millions of music lovers together in spirit on one HCL's platform in times of social distancing, says SHALINI SAKSENA

The COVID-19 has changed the way we live and go about doing our daily chores. This also includes how we look for ways to entertain ourselves. The digital world has exploded and this means how we listen to music as well. From listening to artists perform live to watching them online, today the world is a different place.

Rohit Kaul, head, HCL Digital Concerts tells you that when they had started with Baithak, Baithak US and

ally concerts was not something new to Kaul and his team. They had been organising live streaming of their concerts even during pre-COVID-19 times.

"We had been streaming our live concerts digitally as well. This helped us when we had to quickly go digital. We had requested from the artist community wanting to know what could be done since physical concerts had come to a standstill. Our response was quick due to the learning we had. Along the way, they were several leaning. The positive was that we



Soundscape's journey has been an interesting one since they started holding digital concerts in March last year.

"When we started last year, we never thought we would end up holding so many concerts online. The 100 milestone is truly amazing. We never anticipated that more than 80 million would watch these shows. It has been enriching and gratifying as well. We have not only been able to showcase legends of the industry in our concerts but also many upcoming artists," Kaul says.

He tells you that what they had not planned for was to get a certain number of viewership or how many concerts to hold or if there is an end date to it.

"However, with each of these platforms, be it Baithak or Soundscape, the attempt has been to target a certain type of fans or present to them a certain type of artist. The idea is to also constantly want new platforms and look at new ways on how we can take different type of artists to our audiences," Kaul tells you.

Interestingly, holding virtu-

virtual concert. So many things have become virtual. We are ordering food on app. It is not that we are losing human touch. The human element — the person who created that app — is still there. When we chat over a video call, there are people at each end. That is not going to go away," Chatterjee explains.

His choice of piece for the 100 th milestone was an interesting one well. He chose a piece that had an upbeat feel to it. "Since it was a celebration, I

decided to go with *raag* Maru Bihag; it is very melodious and this was a happy occasion. What I had not thought of was that I would be only doing virtual shows. But things are slowly coming back on track — with live performance and audiences," Chatterjee tells you.

Even last year, when things had eased, things were looking

up. There was a full house for a festival I did in Odisha, I did a couple of shows in Mumbai and there was good attendance. I recently did a show in Chennai and people had turned up in good numbers. I have a show in Mumbai next month. Let's see how that turns out to be. With vaccination drive doing well, fear among people is slowly easing," Chatterjee says.

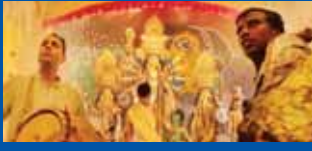

# EATING OUT RIGHT

Weight loss is a journey that must be traversed with patience, over time. This festive season, when you are most likely to eat out, keeping a few things in mind while selecting the dishes should do the trick, writes author **KAVITA DEVGAN** in her new book *The Don't-Diet Plan*, An edited excerpt:

Eating out is a part of life, be it for leisure or due to travel. However, the more frequently you eat out, the more calories you ingest, getting heavier in the bargain. You don't need me to tell you that, you know it already.

Besides, every time you eat out, you ruin your happiness guessing, wishing you knew everything you were wolfing down-fat, calories, sodium, etc. and wondering if you had made a wrong choice and sabotaged your heart's health yet again.

Faced with an extensive tempting menu, it's easy to get carried away and forget all about healthy eating, but making healthier choices need not be a nightmare. Let me show you how.

### GET CUISINE WISE

Here is a brief 'eating out manual' to help you navigate these four very popular cuisines when you go out to enjoy them the next time.

#### Italian

Here the basics are trim and healthy but the offenders to look out for are surplus oil, cream and butter (which are poured freely into most dishes).

Are you wondering what to pick then? Learn to differentiate between Northern and Southern Italian cuisines. Southern Italy traditionally follows a Mediterranean diet, which is rich in grains, fruits and vegetables, contains very little meat and uses olive oil in place of butter. Northern Italian cuisine, on the other hand, is heavy on the beef, butter and cream. Start with plain Italian bread rather than buttered garlic bread. Be careful of fresh Italian bread soaked with deliciously flavoured olive oil too. Salads can be a good starter and filler but make sure that you ask for the dressing and vinegar on the side. An all-vegetable antipasto, insalata-green salad, Panzanella, a tomato and mozzarella salad and fish in cartoccio are some good options. Do you want to eat pasta? Then skip cheese-filled ones in favour of those with red clam sauce or meat sauce. Classic pasta with marinara sauce is a lean choice. And if you want to have a heavier entrée like lasagne, then have only half of it. At the end of the meal, skip the dessert, resist the cannoli or cream-filled pastry and have a decaf cappuccino, made with low fat milk or have fresh fruit.

#### Mexican

In Mexican cuisine, the common offenders to look out for are enchiladas (tortillas fried in oil) and tacos (deep-fried tortillas), chimichangas, chilli rellenos, tostadas and flautas-all of them are deep fried. Cheese and sour cream toppings add extra fat and calories, so

do the side-dishes like chips and nachos.

Are you wondering what to pick then? Take your cue from the names of the menu items. Foods that are prepared 'asada' are grilled, which is a non-fat cooking process. 'Fajitas' are made up of grilled meat or chicken. Use salsa on your main course instead of sour cream and cheese, as 'salsa' made with tomato, onion, chillies and herbs is virtually fat-free and bursting with vitamins A and C. Be extremely careful of the portion size. Choose the dessert carefully-a fruit plate of mangoes, guavas and papaya tastes as good and is far less calorie-dense than sopapillas (deep-fried sweet pastries) or fried ice cream.

#### Greek

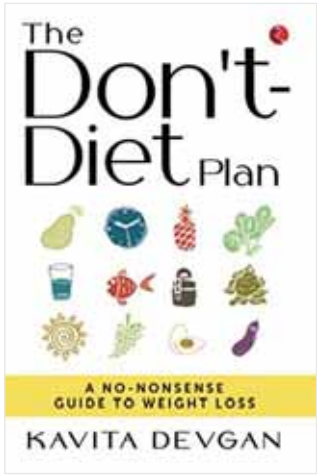
Greek food is super healthy and comprises of grains, fruits and vegetables, olive oil and very little meat. Sauces are based on wine, stocks, tomato and yoghurt, rather than milk or cream. Lentils, beans and vegetables are commonly used in soups, appetizers and main courses. So far so good, but still, you can't be careful enough.

Are you wondering what to pick? The signature of a Greek salad, the 'Greek' olives and feta cheese, are very high in sodium, so go easy. You can even ask to have the feta rinsed before it is served to limit your sodium intake. Be wary of taramasalata, a delicious, though calorie-rich, cream-based dip. Instead, have pita bread spread with a yoghurt-based dip like tzatziki, made with yoghurt, garlic and cucumber. Breadsticks dipped in hummus (sesame paste and chickpeas) or baba ghanoush (eggplant and olive oil) are other good options. For soup, skip the better-known avgolemono soup, which has a lemon and egg base and go for torato, chilled eggplant, peppers and yoghurt soup as this has more fibre and less cholesterol. If you're watching your fat and cholesterol numbers, then pass up moussaka and pastitsio casseroles made from eggs and cheese, and opt for grilled or broiled meat, poultry or seafood.

Some more good options are fish in 'plaki' sauce (broiled with tomato sauce and garlic), souvlaki (lamb marinated in lemon juice, olive oil and herbs, and then skewered and grilled) and dolmas (grape leaves stuffed with ground meat, rice and pine nuts). These are all steamed or baked dishes. And if you will simply perish without baklava for dessert, remember that the usual single portion size can serve two or three people more than adequately. Therefore, order accordingly.

#### Chinese

Chinese food has its share of offenders-hefty sodium content, high fat and big portion sizes, usually due to the Indianization of the

#### Are you diabetic?

Look for high fibre, low-fat dishes. A few great choices are beans, peas and lentils, and dark green vegetables like broccoli, cabbage, spinach and kale. Choose whole grain foods like brown rice, whole wheat bread and pasta and opt for fruits. Everyone, including people with diabetes, should eat three servings of fruit a day.

#### Are you watching your heart?

Skip foods high in saturated fat-foods that are fried or have a crispy coating, cream-based soups and salad dressings, and creamy cheese sauces and gravies. Don't add extra salt anything.

#### Are you watching your waist?

All the above rules apply. Also watch your portions, skip the desserts and go slow on carbs (breads). Load up on fibre (salad and grains) and protein (lean cuts).

#### Do you have a long day ahead?

Add nuts to your salad and an olive oil-based dressing; have a decent-sized helping of whole wheat bread or brown rice and substantial amounts of grilled chicken or fish.

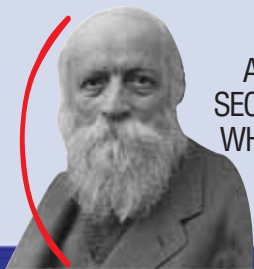
Chinese recipes-the so-called 'Indian Chinese food' (because traditional Chinese cooking is rather light and healthy).

Are you wondering what to pick? Oyster, black bean and soy sauces are full of sodium and monosodium glutamate (MSG). Look out for these words on the menu card and don't hesitate to ask the chef about the ingredients before ordering anything. Deep fat frying is very common, especially in the appetizers, so go easy on fried wontons and egg or spring rolls. Instead, try steamed egg or spring rolls. Order steamed white rice or plain noodles instead of the fried versions (steamed Chinese brown rice is tasty and filling). Be wary of the word 'crispy' as this indicates that the dish is usually deep-fried, as is most of the meat in any dish labelled 'sweet and sour'. Instead, choose a roasted or grilled meat with the sweet and sour sauce on the side (always order sauce on the side and just drizzle some on top).

Eat the way the Chinese really do to stay healthy for the long haul-eat a lot of vegetables. Besides, nowhere else do vegetables taste as delicious as they do in Chinese dishes. Always start with a soup, especially a vegetable base one and round off with a cup of Chinese tea to help wash all the food down.

# IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF RAM

To relive the glory of *bhanja* Ram, Chhattisgarh Tourism launches a new religious tourism circuit, titled Ram Van Gaman Paripath, covering the spots touched by Lord Ram, Mata Sita and brother Lakshman during their exile in the state. **NAVNEET MENDIRATTA** shares the story of the grand launch of the trail

There is a quaint little village near Raipur in Chhattisgarh that is said to be the parental home of Mata Kaushalya, Raja Dashrath's wife and mother of Lord Ram. In the village is the only temple in the world that is dedicated to her. The region was said to be a part of Dakshin Kaushal or Kaushal *raaj*, where Mata Kaushalya came from.

Taking pride in being his maternal home, people of the state see Ram as the nephew of the land (*bhanja* in Hindi). It is said that Ram spent 10 out of 14 years of his exile in the forests of Dakshin Kaushal.

The people of the region, in fact, have unique tradition binds the *mama* and *bhanja* together in a deeper and reverent way. In honour of Lord Ram, even today, the people put the nephew on a pedestal and, irrespective of the age, the uncle (*mama*) pays obeisance to the nephew (*bhanja*) instead of the other way around.

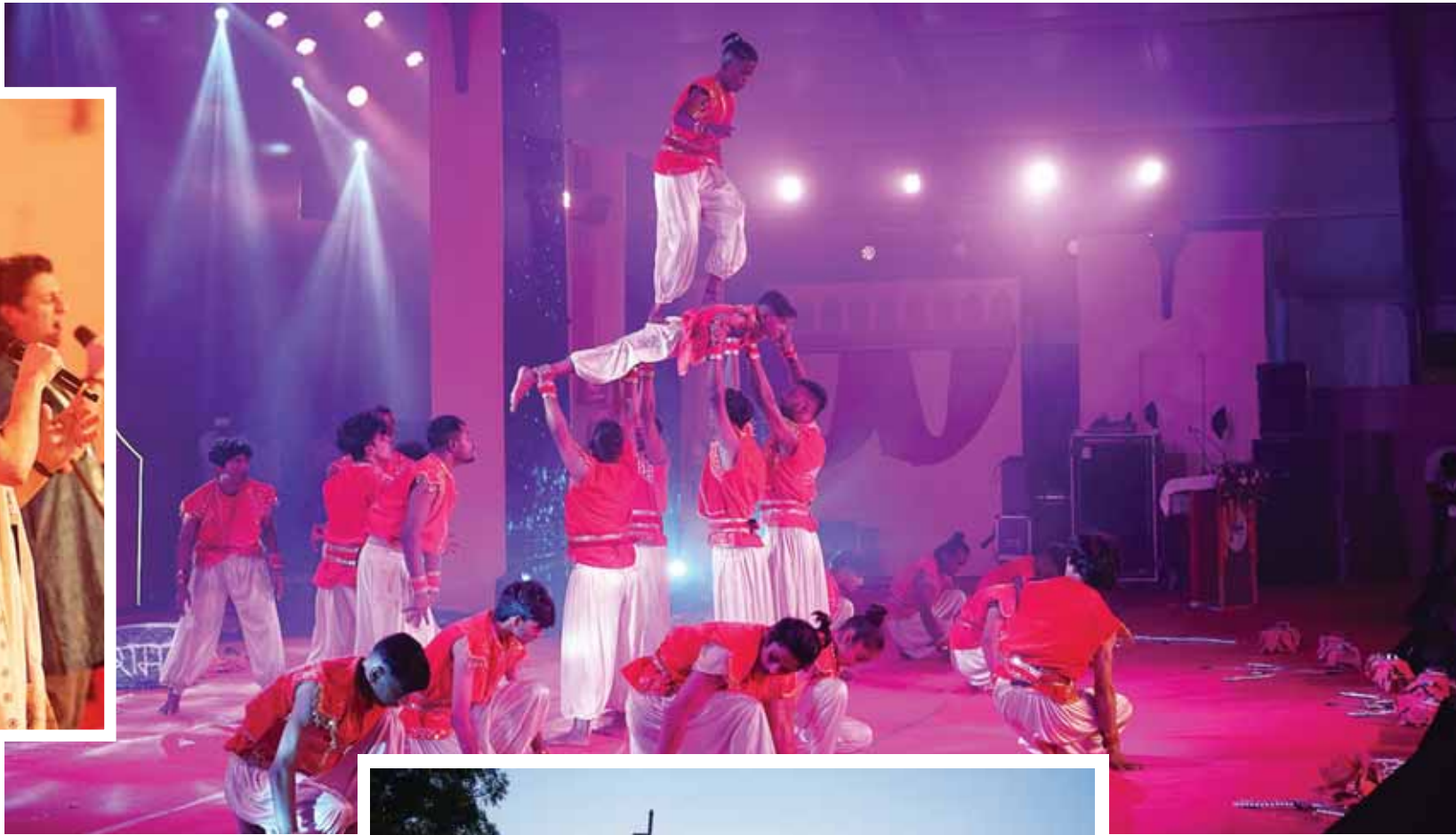
And now for the very first time, the Chhattisgarh government has taken it upon itself to mark the trail and promote it as a tourism circuit. Called Ram Van Gaman Paripath (RGVP), this circuit will cover nine spots along the forested route taken by Lord Ram, before he entered Maharashtra.

Covering a length of 3,000 kms, the Chhattisgarh section of the path starts from Korja district in the north to Sukma in the southern-most part of the state. The nine sites that make a part of the first phase include: Sitamarhi-Harchowka, Ramgarh, Shivrinarayan, Turturiya, Chandkhuri, Rajim, Sihawa, Jagdalpur and Ramaram.

It is believed Lord Ram entered Chhattisgarh from Sitamarhi-Harchauka area in Korja district. Located on the banks of Mawai River, the Seetamadhi-Harchauka's cave houses 17 chambers in it. A structure marked *Sita ki raso* is indicative of their stay here, believe the locals. People also believe that Ram worshipped the Shivaling during his stay in the cave.

Moving onward with his journey, Ram left Ghaghra and arrived at Kotadol, crossing the Ramgarh hills in Sarguja district. Ramgarh is known for Sita Bengra and Jogimara caves. The locals believe Lord Ram spent a few days of his exile along with Mata Sita and brother Lakshman in these caves. The caves also find a mention in Kalidasa's famous piece of literary art *Meghdootam*. Ramgarh is also renowned for one of the oldest '*natyashala*' (amphitheatre) where *Meghdootam* was composed.

The next location is where Lord Ram is said to have accepted the berries offered by Shabari. It is said that Shabari (a tribal woman) had tasted the berries one by one to ensure that she fed only the sweetest ones to Ram. Called Shivrinarayan, the location is a now small town located at the Triveni Sangam (the intersection of 3

rivers) — Shivnath, Jonk and Mahanadi in the Janjgir Champa district.

The village of Turturiya is where Rishi Valmiki had his *ashram*. The ashram is said to be where Sita gave birth to the twins, Luv and Kush. This place is of great religious and cultural significance as it here where Maharishi Valmiki is said to have written his epic work, *Ramayana*, that brought the legend of Ram to the world.

Chandkhuri sits in the middle of the trail. As you move south, you come to Rajim, where Lord Ram is said to have spent some time of his exile in the ashram of Rishi Lomash. Rajim is located at the confluence of the Mahanadi, Sondhur and Pairi rivers and is also known as the *Prayag* of Chhattisgarh. The Shivaling, believed to have been established by Mata Sita, is now housed inside the famous Kuleshwar Mahadev temple. It is said that even today during the floods, the Shivaling does not get submerged.

Sihawa, the revered place of *Sapt rishis* (seven sages) is the place of origin of the divine Mahanadi River. According to a folklore, Lord Ram spent a significant amount of his time at this place meeting and consulting the seven great sages — namely Shringi Rishi, Muchkund Rishi, Agastya Rishi, Angira Rishi, Kankar Rishi, Sharabhang Rishi and Gautama Rishi.

In Jagdalpur are situated the historic Kutumsar Caves, where Lord Ram



is said to have spent considerable time. Located in the famous Bastar district, Jagdalpur was the capital of the erstwhile princely state of Bastar. Even today, a 500-year-old festival, 'Bastar Dussehra', is held that runs for 75 days a year.

The ninth destination in the trail is Ramaram in the Sukma district. This is where Lord Ram is said to have worshipped Bhoomi Devi, a Hindu deity representing the earth. It is believed that you can see the footprints of Lord Ram even today.

The entire trail can be covered over

a period of 10 days, shared Anbalagan P, Secretary Tourism, Chhattisgarh. According to him, these are only nine of the 75 locations on the trail that the state plans to develop over time.

The state is also looking at hosting several festivals to push tourism in the state over the next few years, shared the State Chief Minister, Bhupesh Baghel. "We want the tourists to experience the state hospitality and view it as a religious, cultural and ethnic tourist destination," he said.

It was with this objective that the Chhattisgarh Tourism Board held a

grand launch of the trail on the first day of Navratras. A 51-feet high statue of Ram set against the ancient Mata Kaushalya temple was unveiled. The temple complex wears a grand look following the beautification drive undertaken by the government.

The grand event, curated by Yasmin Kidwai of Springbox Films along with Brandwidth Events, saw a musical opening dedicated to Lord Ram. Local as well as famous national artistes, such as Shankar Mahadevan, Indian Ocean, Kabir Café, Sukriti Sen and V.Unbeatable, participated in the event that was heavily attended by the locals. Noted actor Ashish Vidyarthi played the emcee of the evening. A 3-D film showcasing Ram's story and connect with Chhattisgarh was also showcased. The tourism board also released a special song written by *Indian Ocean's* Himanshu Joshi that evokes the glory of Lord Ram and speaks of his relevance through the ages.

This, in fact, is the first of the many tourism campaigns that the state is planning to launch. Chhattisgarh is looking at hosting traditional as well contemporary festivals and events to create an inclusive tourism strategy. For a state that has been able to settle internal unrest, there is a lot to showcase to the world. The state is also working on creating a Buddhist circuit and connecting it the existing one. There is a lot that the travellers can expect from Chhattisgarh.
