Guru Teg epitome of Indian tradition of sacrifice: Modi

 $\begin{array}{c} R \text{eminding that the 9th Sikh} \\ R \text{Guru Teg Bahadur gave} \\ \text{up his life for his ideals, Prime} \end{array}$ Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday said his "balidan" should be seen as a continuation of great sacrifices made by "our Rishis and Gurus" to defend and preserve the "great heritage and tradition" of India and not as a separate event.

Addressing the nation from the Red Fort to mark the 400th birth anniversary of Guru Tegh Bahadur, the PM said, "In front of Aurangzeb's tyrannical thinking, Guru Tegh Bahadur became 'Hind di Chadar' and stood like a rock This Red Fort is a witness that even though Aurangzeb severed many heads, but could not shake our faith.

The Red Fort was chosen as the venue for the event as it was here that Mughal ruler Aurangzeb had given orders for the execution of Guru Teg Bahadur in 1675

As Shabad Kirtan like "Hari ko naam sada sukhdayi" wafted in the air, Modi wearing a Sikh turban looked immersed in the prayer. He later released a postal stamp and a commemorative coin on the Sikh guru.

Addressing the gathering of the devotees, Modi said,

'When Guru Teg Bahadur was born, it was said that this child will eliminate sorrow of the marginalised. Gurdwara Shish Ganj Sahib, which is close to the Red Fort, is a symbol of

Guru Teg Bahadur's sacrifice."
Seeing a "unity" in the sacrifices made by the Gurus and the "millions" others, Modi said all of them laid down their lives so that Indian heritage

lives on. He said Guru Teg Bahadur lived and sacrificed himself for his ideals

India, he said is "not only a country but a great tradition which is "nursed" by thousands of Rishis and Gurus and that sacrifice of Teg Bahadurji "can-

not be seen separately".

The PM recalled the tremendous services of ten Gurus and specifically referred to Guru Nanak whose travels unified the country.

"Guru Nanak Dev ji united the whole country in one thread. Guru Tegh Bahadur's followers are everywhere. Patna Sahib in Patna and Rakabganj Sahib in Delhi, we see 'El Bharat' everywhere in the form of Guru's wisdom and blessings," he said.

SC raps mayor for demolition drive after stay order

Supreme Court to hear Jahangirpuri anti-encroachment case after 2 weeks

Supreme Court on The Supreme Court on Thursday extended the status quo until further order on the anti-encroachment drive in the violence-hit Jahangirpuri area and expressed displea-sure against the NDMC Mayor for uprooting structures with the use of bulldozers even after the SC passed an order to stay it on Wednesday

Issuing notice to Centre and others, bench of Justices L Nageswara Rao and BR Gavai asked the matter to be listed after two weeks and said it will take a serious view of the demolition which was carried out for more than two hours after the stay order was passed and communicated to the

"Status quo to be maintained till further order...List after two weeks and pleadings to be completed till then," the court said on the petition filed by Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind that claimed that buildings of the Muslim riots accused were



Lawyers Dhusynat Dave, Kapil Sibal, Prashant Bhushan and CPI(M) leader Brinda Karat's lawver Surendranath informed the apex court that NDMC continued demolition for two hours even after the court's order was communicated to

Mayor.
"We will take a serious view of the demolition which was carried out even after the Supreme Court orders, even after NDMC Mayor was informed. We will take that up later," the bench said.

Initiating the arguments, Dave, appearing for Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind, said this matter raises far-reaching questions of constitutional and national importance. The bench asked, What is national importance in this matter? It is only pertaining to an area."

To a query on recent terror attacks in Afghanistan, the MEA Spokesperson said India has been looking at the developments in that country.

"We have seen some of the terrorist attacks. We have always been forthright in our condemnation of terrorist attacks. We are looking at what has been the developments there," Bagchi said.

Delhiites get some respite from heat

Temperature in the national Capital dropped to 35.2 degrees Celsius which is three notches less than the normal temperature for this time of the year

¬he people living in Delhi on Thursday gets a major relief from the heat, as the city witnessed cloudy sky with light rain and dust raging wind, due to which the maximum temperature in the national capital dropped to 35.2 degree Celsius, which is three notches less than the normal temperature for this time of the year, according to the India Meteorological Department.

The minimum temperature in Delhi recorded was 25.8 degree Celsius, which is three notches warmer than the normal for this season, stated the

The relative humidity recorded at the Safdarjung observatory, in the morning at 8:30 A.M was 34 per cent and 36 per cent in the evening at 5:30 P.M.

The weather stations at Ridge, Ayanagar, Mungeshpur, Najafgarh, Pitampura, Palam, Lodhi Road and Jafarpur recorded maximum temperatures of 35.2 degrees Celsius, 43 degrees Celsius, 43.1 degrees Celsius, 43.1 degrees Celsius, 44.3 degrees Celsius, 36 degrees Celsius, 35.2 degrees Celsius and 41.7 degrees Celsius respectively, showed the IMD

The IMD predicted that the Delhi on Friday will witness partly cloudy sky and the maximum temperature will go up to 38 degree Celsius.

On the weekend, the city will witness the strong surface winds during the day time and

the maximum temperature wil surge to 40 degree Celsius," IMD predicted.

The maximum temperature on Thursday decreased by two to seven degree Celsius over most parts of northwest and central India and by two to three degree Celsius over parts of east India and interior Maharashtra," said IMD.

"Maximum temperatures more than 40 Deg. C reported over parts of west Rajasthan, Gujarat State, South Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh Chhattisgarh, interior Odisha, Jharkhand, Vidarbha, Telangana, interior Maharashtra Rayalaseema," said IMD.

According to the sources the power demand in the national capital cooked up to 5657 on Thursday which is less than the power demand recorded on Wednesday which created a history as it was 5761 MW, highest in the month of April till the date.

part of its ongoing Tactical Counter Offensive Campaign (TCOC), Special Operation Squad (C-60) of the Gadchiroli police on Thursday arrested four hard-core Maoists, including a woman, carrying a total reward of Rs. 18 lakh on their heads, from the Nelgunda

Being seen as a significant breakthrough made after they gunned down 26 Maoists in the forests of Gyarapatti in Korchi taluka on November 13, 2021, the C-60 commandos brought off the arrests in the Nelgunda forests located within the limits of Dhodraj Armed Out Post (AOP), as part of an anti-naxal operation launched on the basis of the information that some CPI (Maoists) activists entering Nelgunda village area in plain clothes in order to execute their subversive activities.

Superintendent of Police Ankit Goyal said that of the arrested, two were area commanders, while the other two were members.

Goyal identified the four

Maruti alias Manik Sadhu Gawde (34), Suman alias Janni Komati Kudnami (24) and Ajit alias Bharat, all hailing from different villages in Gadchiroli.

An Area Committee Member (ACM) associated with company no 10, Bapu Wadde had actively participated in the brutal killing of policeman Shri Dushyant Pandhari Nandeshwar at village Kothi on August 14, 2020. He was involved in 13 offences comprising seven murders, three encounters, two robberies and one arson case.

Delhi HC: Cannot force women living in ashram to live with parents

The Delhi High Court Thursday said that while it cannot force the women living in a Rohini ashram under "shocking" conditions to live with their parents, no institution has the licence to conduct its affairs in a manner that violates the fundamental rights of the inmates.

A Bench headed by Acting Chief Justice Vipin Sanghi, which was hearing pleas concerning the state of affairs at Adhyatmik Vidhyalaya founded by self-styled spiritual guru Virender Dev Dixit, said that it was inclined to direct the Delhi government to take over the institution's management and asked the government counsel to seek instructions

The bench, also comprising Justice Navin Chawla, observed that the ashram was run by a "baba" who has been charge-sheeted by the CBI for the offence of rape and is now absconding. The bench recollected an earlier report on the

matter which revealed a 'shocking state of affairs" at the institution and claimed that the women inmates were living in "jail-like conditions", without doors on toilet

The court also asked the counsel for CBI to file a status report on the state of the investigation in the matter. "There is very thorough indoctrination... How can we accept that any sane person would live in these conditions? Can we shut our eyes to it? Who is funding it? Who is managing? This is shocking that this is going on in the capital... We don't want (that) in the garb of spirituality, the inhumane situation conobserved that

The court stated that it is not proposing that the ashram should be shut down but that it has to run in a manner which is consistent with the inmates rights to privacy and bodily integrity and it falls on the State to ensure that infraction of individuals' fundamental rights is prevented and remedied.

Will issue orders on defaulting EV companies: Nitin Gadkari

With increasing incidents of electric two-wheelers catching fire, Union minister Nitin Ğadkari on Thursday said the government will issue necessary orders on defaulting companies after receiving the report of an expert panel that has been formed to enquire into the matter. In a series of tweets, Gadkari said several mishaps involving electric twowheelers have come to light in the last two months.

"We have constituted an expert committee to enquire into these incidents and make recommendations on remedial steps. "Based on the reports, we will issue necessary orders on the defaulting companies," the road transport and highways

minister said. Gadkari added: 'We will soon issue quality-centric guidelines for Electric Vehicles." The minister asserted that if any company is found negligent in its processes, a heavy penalty will be imposed and a recall of all defective vehi-

cles will also be ordered. Meanwhile, companies may take advance action to recall all defective batches of vehicles immediately, Gadkari tweeted. "Under the leadership of PM Shri @narendramodi ji our government is committed to ensure safety of each and every commuter," he tweeted.

over Rs 19,000 while he was paying the registration fee online to apply for a job that did not exist at all, said police.

The accused have been identified as Nitin Singh (30), Sumant Kumar (39), both residents of Noida in Uttar Pradesh, and Mohammad Shahnawaz (23), a resident of New Ashok Nagar, they said. Bhupender Singh (21), a

resident of Shastri Nagar,

lodged a complaint alleging that he saw an advertisement on social media regarding vacancy in the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC), a senior police officer said. After clicking that link, he

received a WhatsApp message having another link to what he thought was a Delhi Metro website, police said. The complainant then

filled in the web form and also uploaded his debit card details for transaction of Rs 49 as required for the purported registration fee. After filling in the one time password (OTP), Rs 19,049 was deducted from his bank account, the officer said.

Meanwhile, another complaint with allegations of cheating through similar modus operandi was also received, they said.

According to the Deputy Commissioner of Police, North district, Sagar Singh Kalsi, during investigation, it was revealed that the accused had been running the racket from Noida. They were arrested on

Nitin revealed that he worked at call centres in Noida from where he learned different modus operandi to cheat job aspirants, the DCP said.

He further disclosed that he created a page on social media for job opportunities in the DMRĆ and uploaded link of his fake WhatsApp number on that page, police said.

Jahangirpuri wears deserted look amid tight security

The media and politicians who came to meet residents were stopped from entering by cops

day after the North Delhi Aday after the North Benn Municipal Corporation (NMC) carried out a demolition drive in communal riot-hit Jahangirpuri, the area's C block continued to wear a deserted look as several shops remained closed and residents preferred to stay indoors as tension prevailed in the locality.

There was heavy security deployment in the area including personnel of Delhi Police, the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and the Reserved Armed Force (RAF).

Police also carried out surveillance of the area the entire day using drones. Over 500 police personnel and six companies of additional forces have been stationed and police teams with their riot gear, including tear gas munitions and shields have been maintaining law and order in the area since Thursday morning. The media and several politicians who came to meet the locals were not allowed to enter the area by the police.

Amid heavy security presence and barricading, the residents of C block were allowed to move in and out only after security clearance. Even the media was barred from entering the block's residential area. Though students were seen going to schools in the morning, most of the other residents stayed home.

A shopkeeper, who did not wish to be named, said that this was the first time the area had witnessed so much unrest. "Earlier, we had celebrated each and every festival together. There was no Hindu or Muslim among the people; we have always stayed together no matter what," he lamented.

"Since the last five days it has become hard to sustain my livelihood as my grocery shop is closed and it is the only source of livelihood for my

Another shopkeeper said that they had been living in Jahangirpuri for the last 15 years and they had never seen the area so tense. "For the last five days, we have been unable to open our shops properly, which has affected our earning. Before this incident there was no discrimination on the basis of caste and religion, we all live here like a family and I hope that the situation gets back to normal as soon as possible," he said. A few shops opened in the afternoon in G block which is meters way from the violencehit area. Though the police has barricaded the entire block the residents were seen moving about and spending time in their lanes.

Though the movement of residents is restricted at C Block, a man was seen pasting documents over the shutter of his shop at Kushal Chowk. The shopkeeper was stopped by the police and asked to return to his residence. Replying to the policemen, the shopkeeper said he was concerned about the shop getting bulldozed and



Addressing the media, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Delhi unit chief Adesh Gupta said, "I am also going to write letters to South and East MCD Mayors to remove illegal encroachments remove illegal encroachments by Bangladeshis and Rohingyas living there." He also slammed Opposition parties, including the Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), saying they were trying to protect "rioters" in Jahangirpuri. "Congress and Left leaders have gone to Jahangirpuri to appease the rioters. I have also learnt that Mamata Banerjee (TMC chief) is also coming to

In view of the sudden spike in the number of Covid cases in the national Capital in the last few days, health experts have not ruled out the possibility of the emergence of new variants of the Omicron which are being sequenced.

Of 2,380 Covid-19 cases that India reported on Wednesday half were from Delhi itself, the highest since February 10, while the positivity rate has jumped to 5.7 per cent against 4.42 per cent on the previous day. In the past few days, Delhi has reported more than 1,000 Covid-19 cases in the national Capital in a single day.

Explaining the surge in Delhi, a senior scientist said Omicron's reproductive number is 10, which has the highest transmissible level, so its derivatives will also have the same transmissibility and will spread in absence of hand at our institute ILBS many hygiene, social distancing and masks. The Delhi Government has already made masks mandatory in a bid to check the spread of the infection.

However, an Indian SARS-CoV-2 Genomics Consortium (INSACOG) source has claimed that Omicron variant derivative BA.2.12.1 has also been found in a few samples in Delhi which is said to be contributing to the recent rise in cases in the US.Dr SK Sarin, Director, Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences (ILBS) in Delhi told a news agency that there is a possibility of new variants of Omicron in Delhi while adding that the samples at the ILBS lab have been sequenced.

SEC orders MCD polls in Capital to be put on hold

The State Election (SEC) has State issued an order putting on hold Delhi, under powers conferred Corporations of Delhi (MCD) in the national Capital, as the Bill to unify the corporations was passed by Parliament.

"As the Central Government has now notified 'The Delhi Municipal (Amendment) Act 2022' and which has been duly published by Ministry of Law and Justice, Govt. of India in the gazette of India on 18th April and wherein three municipal corporations in Delhi, have been reconstituted to have a unified single municipal corporation with a maximum of 250 municipal wards instead of existing 272 wards in all three Corporations, stated order.

"Pursuant to enactment of Delhi Municipal (Amendment) Act 2022, whereby three municipal corporations in Delhi have ceased to

exist and have been replaced by a unified single municipal corporation," said the order. "I, S. K. Srivastava, SEC of N.C.T. of of Constitution of India read with Section 7 of Delhi Municipal Corporation Act, 1957, do hereby keep on hold all preparatory steps for conduct of general election to three Municipal Corporations of Delhi, and rescind following notifications with immediate effect," order stated.

India's ties with Russia in the backdrop of ongoing conflict in Ukraine even while several western nations are imposing sanctions will be discussed in the summit with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, British Prime Minister Boris Johnson said on Thursday. The two leaders will meet in New Delhi on Friday.

Making this assertion in Ahmedabad after arriving from the United Kingdom on a twoday visit, Johnson said, "As I think everybody understands, India and Russia have historically very different a relationship, perhaps, than Russia and the UK have had over the last couple of decades. We have to reflect that reality, but clearly I'll be talking about it to Narendra Modi."

The conflict will figure in the summit with both the sides exchanging their views. However, Britain is likely to maintain its stand that it is not in the business of lecturing or telling other countries what to do, sources said here on Thursday. The two leaders are also likely to review the long term consequences of the Ukraine crisis

Ashram from where Mahatma Gandhi led the freedom struggle against colonial rule, he also touched upon India's views on the conflict and said "Well, they've already raised Ukraine, as you can imagine with Prime Minister Modi. And actually, if you look at what the Indians have said, they were very strong in their condemnation of the atrocities in Bucha."

The British Prime Minister termed Mahatma Gandhi an "extraordinary man" who mobilized the principles of truth and non-violence to change the world for better. Johnson wrote in the visitors' book there "It is an immense privilege to come to the ashram of this extraordinary man and to understand how he mobilised such simple principles of truth and non-violence to change the world for the better.'

also the opportunity for us to deepen our security and defence partnership. As you know, the UK is making an Indo-Pacific tilt in our integrated review of our national defence and security strategy."

Regarding economic ties the British Prime Minister said both the countries are hoping to complete another free trade agreement "by the end of the year, by the autumn."

On the nuances of the summit, sources said here it will focus on the centrality of India in the rise of the Indo-Pacific, in keeping with the priority attached to India in the UK's integrated review of defence, security and foreign policy in 2021. The two sides may also discuss the issue of economic fugitives such as Vijay Mallya and Nirav Modi. Britain is also likely to discuss the issue of pro-Khalistan elements there as it is determined to counterextremism, sources said.

Starting his two-day visit to India, Johnson arrived in Ahmedabad on Thursday morning. On the first day of his tour, Johnson met industrialist Gautam Adani. The visiting Prime Minister began his visit with a roadshow from the Ahmedabad airport to his hotel on Thursday morning.

CBI registers 2 FIRs related to bribery charges by J&K ex-Guv

The CBI has registered two FIRs in connection with The CBI has registered two corruption allegations levelled by former Jammu and Kashmir Governor Satya Pal Malik in the award of contracts for group medical insurance scheme for Government employees and civil work related to Kiru hydroelectric power project in the erstwhile State.

After registering the FIRs, the CBI conducted searches on Thursday at 14 locations in Jammu, Srinagar, Delhi, Mumbai, Noida in Uttar Pradesh, Trivandrum in Kerala and Darbhanga in Bihar, the CBI

The agency has named Reliance General Insurance and Trinity Re-Insurance Brokers Limited as accused in its FIR related to a controversial health insurance scheme for Jammu and Kashmir government employees reportedly cleared by Malik in the State administrative council meeting on August 31, 2018.

"...Unknown officials of Finance Department of Government of Jammu and Kashmir by abusing their official position in conspiracy and conwith Trinity nivance Reinsurance Brokers Ltd, Reliance General Insurance Company Ltd and other unknown public servants and private persons have committed the offences of criminal con-

themselves and caused wrongful loss to state exchequer during the period 2017 and 2018 and thereby in this manner cheated the Government of Jammu and Kashmir," the FIR

It was alleged in different quarters that there were glaring deviations from the government norms in the contract awarded to Reliance General Insurance like absence of an online tender, removal of an original condition that the vendor should have experience of working in the state and companies having turnover of Rs ,000 crore among others.

After allegations of irregularities surfaced, the scheme, which was rolled out on September 30, 2018, was scrapped, they said.

The case was registered on the request of Jammu and Kashmir Government on the allegations of malpractices in award of contract of J&K Employees Health Care Insurance Scheme to private company and release of Rs 60 crore in 2017-18, the CBI said in a statement.

"The governor has approved foreclosure of the contract with M/s Reliance General Insurance Company (RGIC) for implementing group mediclaim health insurance policy for the employees and pensioners in the state," a Raj Bhavan spokesper-

He had said the matter was referred to the Anti-Corruption Bureau for examining the entire process to see whether it was conducted in a transparent and fair manner.

In the scheme which was initially signed up with RGIC for one year, the employees and pensioners would have got Rs 6 lakh cover for themselves and five dependent family members by paying an annual premium of Rs 8,777 and Rs 22,229 for employees and pensioners, respectively. In its FIR relating to the

alleged malpractices in the award of contract for the civil works package of Kiru Hydroelectric power project, the CBI said guidelines related to e-tendering were not followed. The agency has booked IAS officer and former chairman of Chenab Valley Power Projects (P) Ltd, Navin Kumar Chaudhary, former MD, M S Babu besides former directors and Patel Engineering Ltd. MK Mittal and Arun Kumar Mishra. The agency has also named Patel Engineering as an accused in this case.

"Though a decision was taken in 47th Board meeting of CVPPPL (Chenab Valley Power Projects (P) Ltd) for re-tender through e-tendering with reverse auction after cancellation of ongoing tendering process,

meeting) and tender was finally awarded to Patel Engineering Ltd," the FIR alleged.

Malik, who was the Governor of Jammu and Kashmir between August 23, 2018 and October 30, 2019 had claimed that he was offered a Rs 300 crore bribe for clearing the two files.

After going to Kashmir, two files came to me (for clearance), one belonging to Ambani and another to an RSS-affiliated man who was a minister in the previous Mehbooba Mufti-led PDP-BJP coalition government and claimed to be very close to the Prime Minister (Narendra Modi), he had said.

"I was informed by secretaries in both the departments that there is a scandal and I accordingly cancelled both the deals. The secretaries told me that 'you will get Rs 150 crore each for clearing the files' but I told them that I have come with five kurta-pyjamas and will leave with that only," Malik had told a gathering at an event in Jhunjhunu in Rajasthan in October last year.

The civil works package of Kiru Hydroelectric power project was registered at the behest of Jammu and Kashmir government and entailed allegations of malpractices in award of the contract worth Rs 2,200 crore to private company Patel Engineering in 2019, the CBI said in a statement.

According to the text of his speech made available by the Vice-President's Secretariat, he said, "I can assure you all that the politicians are wise and receptive to good suggestions if they are presented to them convincingly

and rationally.' "This is because no minister would like to risk being punished for wrongdoing or a bad decision. The growing nexus between the political class and civil servants being widely referred to as a matter of deep

concern," Naidu said. The vice-president was of the view that civil servants need not take an adversarial position on all matters". "When you are instructed to present a particular issue in a certain manner that suits the political executive, all you need to do is to speak for the right and, if required, do so in writing. "If you are overruled, the authority concerned would be taken to task. The political and permanent executive should work in tandem and in the right manner. The political executive should definitely change," he

All that the officials have to

do, Naidu said, is to show up their character and be on the right side of the law. "If not, you will be conceding ground to your political masters from which neither of you will benefit. On the contrary, the country and the people will suffer that much. So, I advise you to strictly stand up for the right," he advised them. Citing his experience, the vicepresident said 'yes sir' types are not respected in the long run while "speakers of truth" are.

Doctors urge Prez, PM to postpone NEET PG 2022

Several doctors have urged President Ram Nath Kovind and Prime Minister Narendra Modi to postpone the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test The Association for (NEET PG 2022) exam, citing insufficient gap to prepare for the May 21 NEET PG 2022 exam, as the NEET PG 2021 seven electoral trusts received counselling is scheduled to be over only on May 3, and some States' counselling will start afterwards. According to the ADR, 16 out of the 23 electoral trusts

"As per the policy of National Medical Commission (NMC), there needs to be a sufbetween Counselling of one session and next examination. But this year the all-India counselling will be over by 3rd May,2022 and State counselling will start afterwards which might go till mid or may end. The examination is scheduled on 21st May, just a few days after completion of All India counselling. This stands unfair," they said in a letter to the President and the Prime Minister.

Stating that they were in a Catch-22 situation as far as appearing for the NEET PG 2022 exam is concerned, the doctors wrote, " We are in a dilemma if we should attend counselling or prepare for the exam because of this insufficient time gap. The counselling schedule was changed nearly 7 times by MCC this year , also the mop up round was cancelled both at all India and state level. How could we study amongst these uncertainties created by these exam bodies." The letter also referred to

the previous postponement order, where Union Health Minister, Mansukh Mandaviya, had clearly directed NBE to give a 6-8 week gap between counselling and exam. The doctors requested the President, Prime Minister and other concerned authorities to postpone the medical entrance by at least two months. "I request you to kindly intervene in this at the earliest keeping in mind the life of thousands of doctors, whom you once called COVID WARRIORS," the letter concludes.

While senior Congress leaders Oommen Chandy and Srinivas BV took up their cause on the Twitter, Member of Parliament Tejasvi Surya wrote a letter to Mandaviya, pointing out that more than 5,000, interns from Kerala, Bihar, Jammu and Kashmir and Jharkhand are ineligible to write the NEET PG due to a delay in completion of their internship owing to the Covid19 pandemic.

Digital life is driven by urban households, with 41% of urban parents reporting their child started watching TV/phone/computer compared to 26% of rural parents. Conversely, 50% of rural parents reported their child continued to watch TV/ phone/ computer compared to 38% urban parents.

In-depth interviews also revealed that parents used phones and videos as a distraction to reign in their children. 1 in 4 households reported children spending less time with other children including siblings, cousins or neighbors' children of their age. A greater proportion of urban households (29%) reported this than did rural households (23%). Additionally, parents highlight children feeling more isolated and agitated; secondary research suggests higher usage of tech products and less interaction with peers may be a cause.69 During in depth interviews, parents recalled their children becoming agitated due to a lack of routine, lack of social interaction, and staying indoors.

Shah: Terrorism biggest form of human rights violation

Jnion Home Minister Amit Shah on Thursday said terrorism is the biggest form of human rights violation and action against terrorism cannot be contradictory to human rights. Addressing the 13th foundation day of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) here, Shah said strong action has been taken against terror funding in Jammu and Kashmir and against those who had helped terrorism and were living respectfully in society.

Terrorism is the biggest curse for society, he said, adding that if there is any country which bore the maximum brunt of terrorism, it is India. "I have some differences with human rights organisations. Whenever there is an anti-terror action, some human rights groups come forward to raise the issue. But I strongly believe that there cannot be a bigger human rights violation than terrorism. It is the biggest form of human rights violation.

"Action against terrorism cannot be contradictory to human rights. It is absolutely necessary to root out terrorism to protect human rights," Shah

AAP seeks farmers' support in K'taka

"We have to close the 20% and 40% commission accounts of these governments," Kejriwal said, adding that a corruption-free Government could offer several services for free to the people.

Kejriwal congratulated farmers for their massive agi-

tation in the national capital earlier, which forced the Centre to scrap the three farm laws 13 months after their promulga-

Kejriwal said even after 75 years of independence farmers' condition has not improved, though 45 per cent of the population depended on agriculture, the children of farmers don't wish to take up farming.

Kejriwal said the previous Congress government in Karnataka had a 20 percent share in commission from corruption while the present BJP government leads 40 percent commission.

'We, the common people, were challenged to get into politics when we demanded a law against corruption. We formed a political party. Our first gov ernment was formed in Delhi and then in Punjab (this year). Now, we will form our next government in Karnataka," said

"Delhi has zero per cent commission government because there is a hardcore honest government in Delhi. Not a paise is taken as bribe," said the AAP chief.

"I have gotten a certificate from our country's Prime Minister, Modi ji that Kejriwal

Kids of a lesser god?

Besides making the adoption laws more humane, a change in mindset is a must

The Supreme Court has shown interest in a plea to simplify adoption laws in India. It is a tough task. The orphan adoption ratio is highly skewed. There are roughly 30 million orphans, but only around 4,000 adoptions are reported annually. The adoption figure reduced to just over 2,000 in the last two years when work was affected by the Coronavirus pandemic. The lockdown period also made orphans of more than one lakh children because their parents or caregivers succumbed to the virus. The problems begin right from when a child is found abandoned. The Child Care Institutes and the Child Welfare Committee complete all legal formalities to declare the child legally free to be adopted and place them under an agency's care. The system is smooth in urban areas but not so in the countryside and small towns. Some of the CCIs are not even registered. That eventually impacts the total number of legally free children available for adoption. It is also true that a lot of corruption takes place and child traffickers are known to subvert the adoption process and indulge in the illegal sale of infants and toddlers. It is a policing issue that needs an entirely different focus. Be that as it may, the situation in the country is such that the num-

ber of prospective parents is in the thousands and very few children are available for adoption. This increases the length of the adoption process.

Parents seeking adoption have their issues. The gender of the child is an issue. They want 'normal' children; they rarely prefer children with disabilities. There are cases where parents have 'returned' such children. All these are disruptions in the adoption process. The official process is quite complex. There are so many criteria, so many forms to fill, so many institutions to negotiate — all this takes a lot of time. The legal process is equally cumbersome. The sys-

tem is efficient in the big cities but in smaller towns, the cases do not get cleared easily. It depends on the attitude of the local judge. Families visit the courts numerous times, but in vain. There are cases where families have not received court orders even after two years. In others, the Child Welfare Committees do not declare children free for adoption in time and the kids languish in the centres. To speed up the process, the Government recently revised the laws empowering the district magistrates rather than the lower courts to issue adoption orders and monitor the adoption centres. Having said that, the real issue is something else altogether. The approach of the law and that of the adoption centres is parent-centric when it should be childcentric. It is the child's future that is at stake, and the child has no say anywhere. Gender, age, disabilities, looks, skin colour, literally anything can twist the child's fate. Bureaucratic processes can easily be rectified, but what about the mindset?

Bulldozing dissent

Any incident of razing down people's homes has no place in a mature democracy

ow, BSP supremo Mayawati has become the latest politician to jump on to the Jahangirpuri violence controversy bandwagon. Stirring the getting-murkyby-the-hour pot further, she has said that bulldozers were being run in the northwest Delhi locality under the "quise" of checking illegal construction. Several structures were on Wednesday razed in the Jahangirpuri incident during an 'anti-



encroachment drive' conducted by the BJP-ruled North Delhi Municipal Corporation amid an unusually heavy deployment (though the local mayor called it "a routine exercise") of paramilitary and police personnel and the onslaught of the humming bulldozers didn't stop until the authorities received a 'written order' from the Supreme Court in this regard. The facts that obeying the apex court's order was deferred till the last possible moment and that the civic body is ruled by the BJP have also lent credence to the conspiracy theory that the action was really aimed at acting against and intimidating the accused of communal offences - including vio-

lent clashes, stone pelting, arson and firing — during the passage of a Hanuman Mahotsav procession earlier in the same locality.

In fact, directly pointing the finger at the Centre, because law and order isn't a State subject in the national Capital, Mayawati alleged that using religion as a tool in such exercises can harm mutual harmony and destroy the secular fabric of the country. She also put the ball back into the Centre's court when she claimed that "anti-national forces" could take advantage of such a situation. Another point to ponder in the case is that with the same set of facts, the Delhi High Court had earlier refused to "interfere in the (demolition) process at this stage". The moot question that presents itself in the face of this development is: Is Jahangirpuri the only locality in the national Capital that is afflicted by the curse of 'illegal constructions'? Where is the action against the Government officials whose corrupt practices, or at least turning a blind eye to such illegal developments in good time, led to these constructions coming up? Also, is it not the Government's duty to take care of all the migrant population — including spaces for them to stay in, taking care of their health care needs and ensuring their safety and wellbeing — that may be descending upon Delhi in the search of employment or for any other valid reason?

More youth falling in the trap of drugs BRIJENDER SINGH PANWAR



After raising the spectre of horror in Punjab, the menace of drug abuse is haunting Himachal but the infra facilities needed to fight it are missing

he menace of drugs supply, which initially started from Punjab as a smuggling transit point from the 'Golden Crescent' (Afghanistan, Iran and Pakistan) to Europe, first engulfed the State and later spread to the neighbouring Himachal Pradesh. Due to the inability of lawenforcement agencies to control the illegality, all kinds of drugs are being smuggled into Himachal from Punjab. Compounding the matters, drug peddling from the Eastern Golden Triangle (Myanmar, Laos and Thailand) is also thriving simultaneously.

According to a recent report, the prevalence of psychotropic drugs (heroin, charas, ganja, chitta, opioids etc) across the region is roughly three to four times the national average, affecting most youth in the 15-30 age category. In Himachal, 5,972 persons including 44 foreigners have been arrested in 4,514 cases under the NDPS Act from 2019 to 2021. The gravity can be gauged from the Drug Prevention Helpline data, which was launched on January 6, 2022, and is managed jointly by the HP State Mental Health Authority (HPSMHA) and Nasha Nivaran Board. The data indicates that the use of multiple drugs is on the rise and 40 per cent of calls received were related to multiple substance abuse.

In the last four months, 101 calls were received on the helpline, which included 67 calls for help regarding addicts, of which 28 were related to multiple drug users, 15 alcoholic, 13 opioid users, 10 cannabis and one pharma drug while 34 were for queries and information. The maximum cases were from the districts of Solan, followed by Kangra and Mandi. The main reasons for drug abuse were easy availability of drugs, peer pressure, inquisitiveness to try something new and non-cordial relations with family. The problems were more acute in families where there was no elder member to look after the family.

in the face of inept handling of the situation by the administration, the issue of operating deaddiction centres without requi-

site facilities in Punjab's border areas is serious. A case in point is the recent incident where 19 inmates fled a rehabilitation centre at Bir Plassi village in Nalagarh after thrashing the staff. Since running such centres in Punjab is a costly affair, several such centres have come up in Himachal's border areas. Although agencies like HPSMHA have laid down norms for operating such centres, the Rehabilitation Council of India has prescribed the minimum standards for infrastructure and manpower and WHO has recommended treatment protocols, but all rules and regulations are still being violated with impunity.

As per norms, these centres should have at least 75-100 sq ft area per person, facility for sports, yoga and meditation, qualified staff and psychiatrists on call. Actually, however, these centres are operational in substandard rented premises having space constraints, and all the above-mentioned facilities are missing. The patients, most of them hailing from Punjab, fail to get the promised care. Majority of these centres have obtained licences as 'Rehabilitation Centres' and not 'Substance Used Drug Treatment Centres. As rules, they are not allowed to take in drug addicts, but they do it to make easy money.

There is the general tendency in groups of influential, wellconnected people with political patronage coming together to register a society and start such centres without bothering to follow the norms or appointing required specialists. In 2017, the State Government had constituted

the HPSMHA to deal with this problem and made the registration of de-addiction centres mandatory. After receiving complaints of human rights violation, the Authority has taken action against eight deaddiction centres in Una district. Six of these centres have been issued notices and the licences of the other two have not been renewed.

At present, there are 76 private de-addiction and rehabilitation centres operating in Himachal Pradesh with a total capacity of about 2,500 beds. As per Section 20(1) and (2) of the Mental Health Care Act, 2017, the patients admitted to these centres have the right to protection from cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment. Unfortunately, in many cases, the family members of drug addicts lose patience and without understanding their real problems send them to the renabilitation centres. They should get the psychiatry evaluation of the addicts done before deciding to send them to these centres. All six medical colleges in Himachal have a psychiatry department and acute withdrawal symptoms leading to body cramps, irritation and aggressive behaviour should be dealt with under the supervision of trained doctors.

We should understand the background of a person who is drawn into the trap of drugs. Generally, they are ignored or misguided people coming from difficult families. The family members should share quality time and maintain constant communication with one another. As they say, "Prevention is better than cure". The families, schools, colleges, social and cultural organisations should step forward to sensitise the masses, especially the youth, to live a purposeful and content life so that they don't fall into the trap of drugs. We should have regular counselling for youth and their parents.

FIRST COLUMN THE INDIA-UK TRADE AGREEMENT

India and the UK have had a shaky economic partnership, given their historical contexts

K Prime minister Boris Johnson has added momentum to the trade agreement negotiations between the two countries. In March, India and UK officials concluded their second round of negotiations on the proposed Free Trade Agreement. The third round of negotiations will have some officials from UK travelling to Delhi in the last week of April and others joining virtually. The pace of progress of recent trade agreement negotiations between India and the underscores the importance of agile and technologically future-fit for governments in the current work environment. India has recently concluded two minitrade agreements with UAE and Australia within a year of the announcement. The UK on its part has concluded FTAs with Japan and renegotiated its deal with EU. Most of these trade agreements for India and



UK with their respective economic blocks have been concluded during the pandemic years of 2020 and 2021. India and the UK have a shaky economic partnership, given their historical contexts. An independent India has never been able to completely shed the hatred towards its erstwhile coloniser, while many powerful lobbies in the UK haven't been able to give up their "rulers of the region" attitude. The political relations between both have punctured pursual of any significant economic cooperation, even though, both sides maintained a fairly upwardly mobile bilateral trade relation. The colonial ghosts from the past including geopolitical issues such as Kashmir, Pakistan and Partition always shadowed any bilateral economic ties. The UK, aftersevering ties with the European Union andfacing threats to its liberal economy from China, decided to steer its focus towards the Indo-Pacific for strategic and bilateral reasons. It has already entered into amilitary alliance with Australia along with the US (AUKUS)that focusseson security in theregion. The growing closeness between China and Russia, along the current aggression in Ukraine has forced the UK to make the Indo-Pacific a key element of its foreign, trade, political and economic agenda. The only country from the QUAD group with whom the UK doesn't have a significant economic partnership such as a tradeagreement is India.A trade deal with the aim to double bilateral trade between India and UK to about \$100 billion by 2030 seems a focus area for "Global Britain".

India has been dragging its feet on pulling together an economically beneficial trade agreement for nearly a decade. This was primarily a result of its FTAs with ASEAN group and Korea, both of which have competitive rather complementary domestic services and goods, on which limited trade benefits could be achieved by India. A bunch of reforms in India such as the GST regime, cashless toll access, and single-window clearances needed some years of careful alignment of domestic policies with global best practises, before India could boldly negotiate trade agreement terms with new partners. India has shown interest to quickly round up couple of lucrative deals with EU, Canada, Israel and the Gulf Cooperation Council besides the UK. Every minideal or full-fledged free trade agreement would be stepping stone for the next one in line. India did get a taste of negotiating on sensitive matters such as access to agriculture and dairy products, wine and spirits, etc., when it closed the Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement with Australia last month. The UK is a powerful player from the European region with centuries of history of having excelled in trade negotiations. Already business centres from the UK have red flagged "Ease of Doing Business" as key to any proposed India-UK trade deal. This will have to be looked into carefully and significant alignments with benchmarked global practices will have to be done.

overnors in India over the decades were talking less and conducting themselves with regal finesse. Chief Ministers and State Governments were treating them with due respect and diligence. After the BJP came to power in 2014 for the second time, Prime Minister Narendra Modi chose persons with RSS background or BJP leaders for the titular positions. The Modi-era Governors, unlike the ones appointed by Atal Behari Vajpayee, are at loggerheads with non-BJP Chief Ministers.

West Bengal Governor Jagdeep Dhankar and Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee have running battles since his appointment. Maharashtra Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari and Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray are not pulling along well. Tamil Nadu Governor R N Ravi and Chief Minister M K Stalin don't see eye to eye on many issues. Tamilisai Soundararajan, the Telangana Governor, has joined the band of activist Governors who thrive on controversies.

In united Andhra Pradesh there were occasions when Governors played questionable politics. Ram Lal who dethroned NTR for a month became notorious and the movement for restoration of democracy spearheaded by the TDP founder ended only after Ram Lal was replaced by a thorough gentleman like Dr Shankar Dayal Sharma who gave the oath of office to NTR after restoring him as Chief Minister. NTR himself had no respect for Governor Kumudben Joshi but he followed protocol. NTR had problems with Krishan Kanth who decided in favour of Chandrababu Naidu but the actor-turnedpolitician was not in a position to fight.

The relations between Raj Bhavan and Pragati Bhavan (residence of Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao) deteriorated suddenly. Tamilisai went to Delhi and met Modi on April 6 and Union Home Minister Amit Shah the following day. She also spoke to the media without any inhibition ventilating her frustration with the attitude of KCR. Till some months ago, they were on the best of terms. When she did not sign the file pertaining to Kaushik Reddy's nomination to Legislative Council under the Governor's quota, the trouble started.

In the meanwhile, KCR changed his policy and started attacking the BJP gov-Modi directlv. H ing non-BJP Chief Ministers like Uddhav Thackeray and Stalin to form a non-BJP and non-Congress front. KCR's efforts were slowed down after the BJP retained all the four States with handsome majorities. But he raised the paddy bogey demanding the Centre to buy paddy, not rice, as it has been doing in Punjab. He asked for one

ited Yadadri, the renovated temple of Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy, even the Executive Officer was not present to welcome her. No minister and no district collector cared to receive her. Additional Collector Deepak Tiwari was there to greet her with a sapling. When her mother died at the Raj Bhavan, the President of India and the Prime Minister called to say condolences, but KCR did not care to pay floral tributes to the departed soul. He did not even call her. She said her request to provide a special flight to take her mother's body to Chennai was turned down by the Chief Minister. She said all her tours in the State in the last six months were either by road or by train even if it was a distant destination. She has not been invited by the Government to public functions for some months. She travelled to the forest area in Mulugu district on her own to see Sammakka, SaralakkaJaatara where neither the district collector not Superintendent of Police was present to receive her. She was not invited to address the joint session of legislature before the budget was good, the CM would have personally invited the Governor to address the joint session.

Though KCR did not say anything openly against the Governor, his son K. Taraka Rama Rao, the working president of TRS and Minister for Municipal Administration and Information Technology, Jagadish Reddy, energy minister, and others criticized the Governor for airing her views in Delhi. KTR asked when a Tamil nominated as Governor what was wrong in nominating Kaushik Reddy as an MLC? Jagadish Reddy said she visited Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy Temple as a BJP person. Tamilisai took serious objection to this comment. "I visited the temple as a devotee along with my husband. Did I take BJP flag or BJP leadership to the temple? I did not even care whether the protocol was followed," said Tamilisai in Delhi after meeting Amit Shah. She, in turn, challenged the ministers to show one instance where she used Raj Bhavan for promoting BJP interests. "I am prepared to reveal the appointments given in the last two years" she volunteered. The Governor said she is entitled to respect as a woman if not as a Governor. She used to call CM 'Anna (brother)' and she deserved to be treated well even as

Tamilisai said she felt ignored and insulted by some actions of the government. She said the ministers and officials have been skipping important events at Raj Bhavan and they should understand that individual. The latest cut was on Ugadi day when not a single TRS leader or government official accepted her invitation to visit Raj Bhavan. Even in Delhi, the Commissioner of Telangana Bhavan reportedly did not receive her or met her although she was at Sabari block in the Bhavan for two days.

The Governor went on to lambast the State government. She spoke of the drugs mafia and

Nadu BJP leader Tamilisai could be neglected Government hospitals and universities where 60 percent of faculty positions are lying vacant. 'As a mother I feel bad for the youth in the State who are becoming drug addicts,' she said. She is understood to have given her report on drugs and corruption to the Prime Minister and Home Minister. KTR, however, asserted that

they have great respect for the constitutional post of Governor. He said, "Why should we have any disharmony with the constitu-tional head." The TRS leaders have taken objection to the Governor making allegations of The attitude of the Chief

Minister towards the Governor depends on the relationship hehas with the Prime Minister and the BJP. KCR was friendly with the NDA dispensation till recently supporting all the Bills, including the three controversial farm Bills, introduced by Modi government in Parliament. KCR probably imagined, as did Chandrababu Naidu in 2018, that the BJP would lose in UP and other three States there would be room for him to play a national role in mobilizing regional parties on one plank. In spite of the solid win by the BJP, the TRS continues to be belligerent and the agitation to force the Centre to buy paddy goes on unabated. How would KCR manage the contradictions and find a way to normalize the relationship with the BJP and the Prime Minister remains in the realm of imagination.

Guru Tegh Bahadur, the defender of Hindustan

The Guru decided to resist the nefarious act of forcible conversion of Hindus even at the cost of his life

→he year-long celebrations to commemorate the 400th birth anniversary (Prakash Purab) of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur concluded on April 21 with an address by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi from the Red Fort in Delhi. Prime Minister Modi has all along shown great reverence for

the Sikh Gurus. The Prakash Purab serves an ideal opportunity to recall atrocities and persecution suffered by our forefathers at the hands of Muslim rulers and the supreme sacrifice made by the Sikh Guru to protect their freedom and dignity. Hindus, and later the Sikhs, suffered the worst of violence and religious persecution by the Mughals. Guru Nanak's agony over brutal tyranny of Babur, the first Mughal invader, is echoed in his

own words: "Khurasan Khasmana Kiya Hindustan Draya. Apey Dos Na Deyi Karta Jum Kar Mugal Chareya. Eyti Mar Pyee Kurlanney Tain Ki Dard Na Aiya". Hindus and Sikhs also suf-

fered the worst brutality during fifty years of Mughal emperor Aurangzeb's reign (1658-1707). Aurangzeb was a cruel bigot who wanted to establish Muslim theistic state, Dar-ul-Islam, in India by the power of the sword. With this sinister design, he ushered a reign of terror and tyranny on Hindus. They were coerced to choose between Islam and merciless oppression. He ordered heavy- handed implementation of ruthless Islamic fundamentalist programs on Hindus and Sikhs. Religious tax (jazia) was



to curtail their economic sustenance. Celebration of the most popular Hindu festivals, Diwali and Holi, were forbidden. Many sacred Hindu Temples were demolished, and mosques erected in their place. Forced mass conversion of Hindus and Sikhs imposed exclusively on Hindus to Islam became the first and

foremost function of the Indian Islamic state. Resistance to these atrocities meant loss of life and dignity. Under this genocidal tyranny, millions of Hindus, most in Kashmir, were massacred and their property looted.

According to the earliest historical narrative relied on by the SGPC and other historical literature, Hindus of Kashmir, unable to withstand the tyranny unleashed by Aurangzeb, approached Guru Tegh Bahadur for support. The Guru accepted their prayer and agreed to defend their freedom to religion and religious right to wear their 'sacred threads and frontal marks.' He decided, even if it cost him his life, to resist the nefarious act of forcible conversion of Hindus. On his instructions, a communication was sent to the emperor asserting

that if the Sikh Guru could be persuaded to accept Islam, the Hindus would convert as well. Hearing this, the Guru was summoned by Aurangzeb to Delhi, and, when he refused to forsake his faith, he was publicly decapitated on November 11, 1675 and his followers were butchered for their refusal to abandon their faith. Thus, the Guru led a stubborn but nonviolent resistance against zealous proselytization and bigotry of Aurangzeb and willingly sacrificed his life to protect Hindustan. But for his sacrifice, Hindustan would have been

Islamised. Guru Tegh Bahadur was the second Sikh Guru to be executed by the Mughals for their unyielding commitment to freedom of religion. Seventy years before his execution (1675),

Guru Tegh Bahadur's grandfather, the fifth Guru of the Sikhs, Guru Arjan Dev (1563-1606), was tortured by emperor Jahangir. He was chained and thrown into the river Ravi on May 30, 1606 at Lahore. The resistance against religious persecution demonstrated by Guru Arjan Dev, Guru Tegh Bahadur and his son and successor, Guru Gobind Singh, invited the wrath of the Mughal empire. While the two elder sons of Guru Gobind Singh died in battle against Mughals, his two younger sons were bricked alive for refusing to embrace Islam and protecting the persecuted.

The Hindu-Sikh bond has been cemented in perpetuity by the blood and sacrifice of the Sikh Gurus. And there is universal acknowledgement and gratitude of the Hindu community

towards the Sikh Gurus and the Sikhs on account of the sacrifices made by them for the protection of Hindu faith. In recognition of this, Prime Minister Modi arranged worldwide celebrations of the 550th Prakash Purab of Sri Guru Nanak Dev and the 350th Prakash Purab of Sri Guru Gobind Singh with immense reverence and fervour. To honour Chote Sahibzadas, December 26 will be celebrated annually as Veer Bal Diwas all over the country.

But some anti-national elements attempt to sow the seeds of division between Hindus and Sikhs. To achieve their nefarious designs, they project fake threat to the Sikh identity. These evil designs must be frustrated. Guru ka Khalsa is invincible. There is no threat to it, least of all from Hindus.

Lanka Opp for constitutional amendment to end presidential system

Sri Lanka's main Opposition SJB on Thursday presented a constitutional amendment bill that among other provisions seeks to abolish the presidential system of governance, in existence in the country since 1978, and replace it with a system that reinforces constitutional democracy.

The move by the Samagi Jana Balavegaya (SJB) party came in the backdrop of mas-sive protests demanding the

resignation of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and his Sri Lanka Podujana (Peramuna)led government over the country's worst economic crisis. The SJB presented the draft

21st constitution amendment bill to the secretary-general of parliament with proposals including the abolition of the current executive presidential system."We have handed over to the Speaker our proposal to abolish the executive presidential system," main Opposition leader Sajith

Premadasa told Parliament.The SJB document proposes to abolish the executive presidential system and replace it with a system that reinforces constitutional democracy".

While the president will remain the head of state and the commander in chief, the president has no personal discretion in appointing or dismissing the prime minister, according to the proposal. The prime minister shall be the head of the Cabinet of ministers and the ministers are to be

appointed by president on the prime minister's advice, it adds. The amendment, while seeking to annul 20th Amendment adopted in 2020, aims to restore Amendment to Constitution to curb the powers of the president and empower Parliament.

The 19A adopted in 2015 pruned presidential powers by empowering the 225-member Parliament above the executive

However, the 19A was scrapped after prime minister Mahinda Rajapaksa's younger brother Gotabaya Rajapaksa won the November 2019 presidential election. The powerful Rajapaksa family tightened their grip on power after

their massive victory in the general elections in August 2020 which allowed them to amend the Constitution to restore presidential powers and install close family members in key positions.

. Gotabaya Rajapaksa is under pressure to quit along with his family as street protests have raged over the government's mishandling of the island nation's worst-ever economic crisis. The demand is to set up an interim cabinet of all parties and restore the 19A which would deprive Gotabaya Rajapaksa of the full powers of the presidency.

RAJAPAKSA PROMISES JUSTICE TO EASTER SUNDAY ATTACK VICTIMS

The Sri Lankan government will not rest until justice has been served to the guilty behind the 2019 Easter terror attacks, Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa vowed on Thursday as the island nation marked the third anniversary of the worst terror incident that killed 270 people, including 11 Indians.

"Today we remember with grief, the tragic events that transpired 3 years ago on that fateful #Easter morning. We mourn the loss of innocent lives and the lives that were impacted. #GoSL has since made every attempt, to bring those responsible to justice, Rajapaksa tweeted.

Nine suicide bombers belonging to local Islamist extremist group National Thawheed Jamaat (NTJ) linked to ISIS carried out a series of devastating blasts that tore through three Catholic churches and as many luxury hotels on April 21, 2019, killing nearly 270 people, including 11 Indians, and injuring over 500. The attack stirred a polit-



ical storm as the then government headed by President Maithripala Sirisena and Prime Minister Wickremesinghe were blamed

for their inability to prevent the attacks despite prior intelligence being made available. Thus far 735 persons have been taken into custody, 27 cases against 79 persons have been filed under 25,653

The govt. Will not rest until justice has been served to the guilty with strict adherence to rule of law and due process," Rajapaksa said in another tweet. The victims' families led by the head of the local church, Archbishop of Colombo

Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith, have been critical of the slow pace of the investigations which they claim is a political ploy for cover up.
On Sunday, hundreds of

people staged a silent protest in Sri Lanka's capital, demanding justice for the victims of the Easter terror attacks. The protesters joined hundreds of people camping near the President's Office in Colombo seeking resignation of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and all members of his family from the government over the worst economic crisis that has caused critical shortages of fuel, food and medicines in the country. Displaying banners and placards, protesters called for justice for the victims of the

"3 years and still no justice," read a banner carried by protesters who walked a 5-mile stretch to the site to be joined by thousands who have been carrying out the protest since April 9 demanding President Gotabaya's resignation over the unprecedented economic crisis - the worst-ever in the country's history.

A special presidential probe found then president Sirisena himself along with a host of other top defence officials guilty of ignoring prior

intelligence.

The panel report had recommended criminal action against them. Archbishop Ranjith has been regularly expressing disappointment over the police investigation and its slow nature.

In November last, President Gotabaya Rajapaksa had asked his detractors to be careful while demanding quick action against the perpetrators of the deadly Easter terror attacks, warning that his government can "act tough" on the critics if the need arises.

He had said the judicial proceedings were underway and his government will not interfere in them. President Rajapaksa is the younger brother of Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa. The two brothers led a decisive campaign that helped end the island nation's three decade long civil war against the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE).

Explosion in north Afghanistan kills at least 10, injures 40

series of explosions across Afghanistan on Thursday killed at least 10 people and wounded scores more, according to police and hospital offi-No one immediately took

m F}$ rom attacks on "wokeism" to crackdowns on mosques, France's presidential campaign has been especially challenging for voters of immigrant heritage and religious minorities, as discourse painting them as "the other" has gained ground across a swath of French soci-

French voters head to polls on Sunday in a runoff vote between centrist incumbent Emmanuel Macron and nationalist rival Marine Le Pen, wrapping up a campaign that experts have seen as unusually dominated by discriminatory discourse and proposals targeting immigration and Islam.

With Le Pen proposing to ban women from wearing Muslim headscarves in public, dent Naila Ouazarf are in a bind. "I want a president who accepts me as a person," said Ouazarf, clad in a beige robe and matching head covering. She said she would defy the promised law should Le Pen become president, and pay the eventual fine.

Macron attacked Le Pen on the headscarf issue in their presidential debate on Wednesday, warning it could stoke "civil war". Polls, however, put Le Pen closer to Macron than she was in their last runoff five years ago.

And in the first round, farright candidates Le Pen and Eric Zemmour together collected nearly a third of votes.

France has no hard data on voters' race or religion because of its doctrine of colour-blind-

ness, which sees all citizens as universally French and encourages assimilation. Le Pen's National Rally party, formerly called the

National Front, has a history of ties with neo-Nazis, Holocaust deniers and militias who opposed Algeria's war for independence from colonial Le Pen has distanced her-

self from that past and softened her public image, but a top priority of her programme is to prioritise French citizens over immigrants for welfare benefits, which critics see as institutionalising discrimination. She also hopes to ban

Muslim women from wearing a headscarf in public, toughen asylum rules and sharply curtail immigration.

She has gained ground among voters since 2017, when she lost badly to Macron. This time around, Le Pen has put a greater emphasis on policies to nelp the working poor.

Le Pen can also thank the rabble-rousing Zemmour, who came in fourth in the firstround vote, for boosting her popularity by making her seem softer. Zemmour has been repeatedly convicted of inciting racial or religious hatred.

southern Israeli city of Sderot, a frequent target, and another fell short and landed in Gaza, the Israeli military said. The launches set off air-raid sirens across parts of southern Israel, disrupting the quiet of the Passover holiday week. Early Thursday, Israeli war-

Putin tries to claim Mariupol win but won't storm holdout

 $R^{ussian \; President \; Vladimir}_{Putin \; tried \; to \; claim \; victo-}$ ry in the strategic port of Mariupol on Thursday, even as he ordered his troops not to storm the last pocket of Ukrainian resistance in the war's iconic battleground.

Russian troops have besieged the southeastern city since the early days of the conflict and largely pulverized it - and top officials have repeatedly indicated it was about to fall, but Ukrainian forces stubbornly held on.

In recent weeks, they holed up in a sprawling steel plant, and Russian forces pounded the industrial site and repeatedly issued ultimatums ordering the defenders to surrender.

"The completion of combat work to liberate Mariupol is a success," Putin said. "Putting such an important centre in the south as Mariupol under control is a success.

But the Russian leader said that, for now, he would not risk sending troops into the warren of tunnels under the giant Azovstal plant, instead preferring to isolate the holdouts who have captivated the world's attention "so that not even a fly comes through.

the plant was blocked off, while giving yet another prediction that the site could be taken in

Putin's order may mean that Russian officials are hoping they can wait for the defenders to surrender after running out of food or ammunition. Bombings of the plant could well continue.

Even though Putin painted the mission to take Mariupol already a success and said the city had been "liberated," until the plant falls, he cannot declare a complete victory.

Russian Defense Minister Sergei Shoigu said about 2,000 Ukrainian troops remained in the plant, which has a labyrinth of tunnels and bunkers that spread out across about 11 square kilometers.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said that about 1,000 civilians were also

istry has barred public sector enterprises from bidding for other Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) which are on the block for privatisation, as it would defeat the very purpose of the disinvestment pol-

Stating that transfer of management control from the government to any other government organisation or state government may continue the "inherent inefficiencies" of state-run firms, the ministry said such transfer would defeat the very purpose of the new PSE policy.

"As a general policy, Public Sector Enterprises (PSEs) (Central /State /Joint)/ State Governments/Cooperative Societies controlled by the Governments ... Are not permitted to participate in the strategic disinvestment/privatisation of other PSUs as bidders unless otherwise specifically approved by the central government in public interest," the Department of



Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM) said.

PSEs controlled by the government include those where 51 per cent or more ownership is with the Centre/state governments or jointly with central and/or state governments.

In the past, the government has sold its majority stake in certain CPSEs to public sector companies operating in similar sectors -- which

helped it meet the disinvestment target set for a particular

In 2001-02, 74 per cent government stake in Indo Burma Petroleum Co (IBP) was sold to Indian Oil Corp (IOC) for Rs 1,153 crore.

More recently, in January 2018 Oil and Natural Gas Corp (ONGC) bought the government's entire 51.11 per cent stake in HPCL for Rs 36,915

Market rally: Investors richer by over ₹5.74 lakh cr in two days

New Delhi: Investors have become richer by over Rs 5.74 lakh crore in two days of market rebound, boosted by bargain-hunting and a supportive trend overseas.

The BSE benchmark Sensex zoomed 874.18 points or 1.53 per cent to finish at 57,911.68 on Thursday, Halting tis five-day fall on Wednesday, the Sensex had closed 574.35 points or 1.02 per cent higher

In tandem with the recovery in equities, the market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms jumped by Rs 5,74,427.92 crore in two sessions to stand at Rs 2,71,77,156.37 crore.

"Positive global clues lifted sentiments for the second straight day. The board-based rally saw buying across different sectors," said Shrikant Chouhan, Head of Equity Research (Retail), Kotak

M&M was the top gainer among the Sensex constituents on Thursday, climbing 3.50 per cent, followed by Maruti Suzuki, Bajaj Finsery, Asian Paints, Reliance Industries, Kotak Mahindra Bank, HDFC and TCS.

In the broader market, the BSE smallcap gauge jumped 1.33 per cent while the midcap

index gained 1.28 per cent.
As many as 2,303 stocks advanced, while 1,115 declined 103 and remained unchanged.

Among BSE sectoral indices, auto jumped the most by 2.14 per cent, followed by consumer discretionary goods and services (1.60 per cent), finance (1.54 per cent), industrials (1.45 per cent) and IT (1.45 per cent). Metal index was the only laggard.

Niti Aayog issues draft battery swapping policy

Moots incentives, rigorous testing protocol

New Delhi: Government think tank Niti Aayog on Thursday came out with a draft battery swapping policy for electric vehicles and suggested incentives as well as a rigorous testing protocol for swappable batteries. The draft policy also comes at a time when there are rising concerns over safety issues around electric vehicles in the wake of multiple instances of such vehicles catching fire.

The Aayog in its draft policy further said all major cities such as state capitals, ÚT headquarters and cities with population above 5 lakh will be covered under the second phase, given the importance of the two-wheeler and three-wheeler vehicle segments in growing

The policy seeks a level playing field across business models involving the sale of EVs with fixed or swappable

The draft policy also prooses that demand side incentives offered under existing or new schemes for EV purchase can be made available to EVs with swappable batteries eligible under this policy.

"The size of the incentive could be determined based on the kWh rating of the battery and compatible EV," it sug-

As per the draft policy, an appropriate multiplier may be applied to the subsidy allocated to battery providers to account for the float battery requirements for battery swap-

It is also proposed that a seamless mechanism for the disbursement of subsidies shall be worked out by the ministry or department concerned, the draft policy stated.

Investments through P-Notes decline to ₹87,979 cr in March

New Delhi: Investments in the Indian capital markets through participatory notes (P-notes) dropped to Rs 87,979 crore as of March-end, with experts believing that foreign investors will continue to adopt a cau-

"We will see some liquidity drying up from global markets over the coming months resulting in the continuation of pressure in P-notes participation for a few months.

However, we believe that the India story is intact and the world's leading economies are looking at trade partnerships with us," said Divam Sharma, founder at Green Portfolio, a Sebi-registered portfolio management service provider.

P-notes are issued by registered Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) to overseas investors who wish to be a part of the Indian stock market without registering themselves directly. They, however, need to go through a due diligence process.

Bangladesh Commerce Minister Tipu Munshi told PTI that his country's Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina made a special exemption for India in the last couple of years from the blanket export ban on hilsa sale, which helps in conserving the fish and keeps prices from spiralling in the home market.

"Our prime minister made a special exemption during the Durga Puja festivities for India, because we know the fish is special during that season," said Munshi, who hails from Gopalganj -- known for its hilsa

Besides the high demand



during the festive season, many 'Shakt' believers also make a sacrificial offering of hilsa to Goddess Durga.

Bangladesh exported about 2,500 tons of the fish during the last Durga Puja to India, most of which were snapped up in Kolkata's markets.

Munshi, who met West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee earlier this week during his trip to Kolkata, said she raised the issue of hilsa exports, pointing out that the demand has always been pos-

'Mamata-di told me, 'Hasina-ji ke ilish pathate bol-ben' (tell Sheikh Hasina to send hilsa -- this year too)," Munshi said, indicating that the Bangladeshi response would be considered in a positive spirit, given the good relations.

About 86 per cent of the global hilsa catch is found in Bangladesh waters. The fish, which travels upstream from the sea to breed, is a prized catch because of its taste. Connoisseurs consider the hilsa from the Padma river, a distributary of the Ganges which courses mostly through Bangladesh, to be the tastiest.

Hasina has used exports and gifts of hilsa as part of her

Bangladeshi reception to her diplomacy toolkit with India since 1996 when she first became the prime minister of Bangladesh. Her first gift of hilsa was to Jyoti Basu, the then chief minister of West Bengal in what many saw as part of sweeteners to hasten the Farakka water-sharing agree-

ment.

In 2013, when the then Indian President Pranab Mukherjee went to an official dinner during his trip to Dhaka, she laid out a large banquet where hilsa was the main offering, knowing fully well 'Pranab-da's' love for the fish.

In 2016, ahead of Mamata Banerjee's swearing in ceremony, a gift of 20 kg of the prized fish was specially flown in for her table as part of the congratulatory message. PTI

Govt must keep 5G spectrum fee low; faster roll out to have greater impact, says Airtel

Mumbai: Telecom service operator Airtel on Thursday urged the government not to charge high fees for allotting 5G spectrum, saying a faster roll out of the next-generation telecommunication network can have more benefits than collecting revenue in upfront cost.

Sunil Bharti Mittal, chairman of Bharti Enterprises which runs the country's second largest telco, said that there are a variety of applications across sectors ranging from healthcare to video interactions, which will make 5G a technology to be introduced as

soon as possible. "5G is important and that's

why we keep on requesting the government to make the 5G as an enabler for hundreds of things that we develop in the country, to keep the spectrum at affordable pricing, to not load the industry too much," Mittal said at the Times Network

India Economic Conclave. Mittal argued that instead of devoting money on spectrum acquisitions, service providers can invest in faster roll out of the network, which will deliver high speed con-

nectivity with lower latency. "I will say the multiplier impact that a faster, highspeed, low-latency network can have for a country is many

times more than what can be achieved by picking up some money upfront," he added.

In the past, telcos have complained about high reserve prices being a deterrent, and the high cost for spectrum has been called out as one of the reasons why the telecom industry has been in a poor financial position for the last few years.

About the proliferation of private and unregulated cryptocurrencies, Mittal said such instruments pose a "serious problem" and backed finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman's plea at a global forum in Washington for a concerted

"It is a great honour to be appointed manager of Manchester United and I am hugely excited by the challenge ahead,"

said Ten Hag.
"I know the history of this great club and the passion of the fans, and I am absolutely determined to develop a team capable of delivering the success

they deserve.

"It will be difficult to leave Ajax after these incredible years, and I can assure our fans of my complete commitment and focus on bringing this season to a successful conclusion before I move to Manchester United.

United sit sixth in the Premier League, 23 points behind leaders Manchester City, and are unlikely to qualify for next season's Champions League.

The club have been looking for a permanent manager since Ole Gunnar Solskjaer was sacked in October.

Earlier, Mumbai Indians posted 155 for 7 as Tilak Varma top-scored for MI with 51 not out from 43 balls while Suryakumar Yadav chipped in with a 21-ball 32. For CSK, Mukesh Choudhary took three wickets for 19 runs while Dwayne Bravo got two. Mukesh Choudhary scythed through Mumbai Indians' top order to remove Rohit Sharma and Ishan Kishan for duck in the powerplay. He then removed Dewald Brevis for seven, reducing Mumbai to 23/3 in the first three overs. Mitchell Santner affected further damage by taking the prized wicket of Suryakumar Yadav (32). Kieron Pollard also perished cheaply but youngster Tilak Varma notched up a brilliant half-century to bail Mumbai out of a precarious position. Varma's fighting 51 powered Mumbai to 155/7 in 20 overs.

Yuzvendra Chahal's bagful of tricks will meet its perfect match in Kuldeep Yadav's guile as the two wrist spinners are expected to dictate the narrative when Rajasthan Royals clash with Delhi Capitals in an IPL match, on Friday.

With current 'Orange Cap' holder in Jos Buttler (375 runs) and 'Purple Cap' holder Chahal (17 wickets) in their ranks, Royals are a team that is looking pretty formidable at the moment even with a dysfunctional middle-order, save Shimron Hetmyer.

On the other hand, resurgent Capitals are battling the agony that comes with a mini COVID-19 outbreak in the camp but are still trying to put their best foot forward to stay afloat. In this backdrop,

the two wrist-spinners, who are currently dominating the bowling charts will be itching to show their wares with Kuldeep (13 wickets at No 2) expected to pose some questions for in-form Buttler in case there is a match-

For Delhi, Kuldeep along with Axar Patel and Lalit Yadav would like to stem the run-flow but stopping Buttler will be on top of their agenda on a Wankhede track that is expected to be good

For Chahal, how he varies the pace against a rampaging David Warner or the ever-attacking Prithvi Shaw and skipper Rishabh Pant will be a delight for the fans. In the past five years, life has come

to a full circle for 'Kul-Cha' who were the 'taste' of the nation between 2017 and 2019 when wrist spinners were in vogue during the Ravi Shastri-Virat While Chahal got a body blow

after being dropped from the last T20 World Cup squad and was sporadicalpicked in white ball formats, tuldeep also lost his way. He got very little support from

either erstwhile national team management or his previous IPL team (KKR) and also endured a careerthreatening knee injury. But now the smile is back and so

is the guile. The left-arm wrist spinner's googly — the one that turns away from right-hander — is back and so is the conventional left-arm leg-break which comes into the right-hander.

However in these kind of games, the support cast becomes more important as they can create those little game-changing moments that impact the final outcome of the game.

Mustafizur Rahaman's cutters and Khaleel Ahmed's clever change of pace could also trouble the likes of Sanju Samson and Riyan Parag. Similarly, if Trent Boult gets one

to tail in first-up, Shaw's response and technique will be tested in earnest.

But Royals have now got a calm death bowler in West Indies' Obed McCoy, who was brilliant while bowling the final over against KKR.

If middle-order non-performance is an issue for Royals, the DC doesn't seem to have found the second Indian batter in that middle-order slot apart from skipper Pant, who can take the bowling apart.

Pathirana replaces Milne in CSK squad

hennai Super Kings on CThursday named young Sri Lankan pacer Matheesha Pathirana as replacement for injured Adam Milne in the ongoing Indian Premier League.

New Zealand's Milne suffered a hamstring injury in CSK's first match against Kolkata Knight Riders on March 26, which was also the season opener, weeks after which he has been ruled out of the tournament.

Pathirana, a young 19-year old medium pacer, was a part of Sri Lanka's U19 World Cup squads in 2020 and 2022.

"He will join CSK at the price of INR 20 lakh," the IPL said in a statement.

Bumrah, Rohit among Wisden's five 'Cricketers of the Year'



Rankireddy, Chirag Shetty and B Sumeeth Reddy while Sindhu will lead the women's squad which has Aakarshi Kashyap, Treesa Jolly, Gayatri P and Ashwini Ponappa. Sumeet Reddy and Ponappa made the cut in the men's and women's squads respectively for the Commonwealth Games after their top-place finish in the mixed doubles category. Hooda, the teenage sensation from Rohtak, caught the selectors eyes as she secured a place for the Asian Games as well as Uber Cup by finishing third in the women's singles after Kashyap and Ashmita Chaliha, who claimed first and second positions respectively.

A 10-member women's

team for the Asian Games and Uber Cup will comprise Sindhu, Kashyap, Chaliha, Hooda alongside Top-3 doubles pairs from the trials -- Treesa Jolly-Gayatri P, N Sikki Reddy- Ashwini Ponappa and Tanisha Crasto-Shruti Mishra.
