ry which can never be forgotten. The violence and hatred of the Partition claimed millions of lives and displaced innumerable people." He added that this day will

remind the young generation about the torture and pain suffered by people during the Partition and will continue to inspire countrymen to maintain peace and harmony in the nation.


The BJP targeted the Congress without naming it on the day in a video clip and sought to know why the Partition could not be prevented by those who were in charge then.

The BJP's video featured Cyril John Radcliffe, whose partition map split Punjab and Bengal almost in half, questioning how a person who had no knowledge of Indian cultural heritage was allowed to divide India in merely

Significantly, the video which narrated the Partition story had visuals of the first Prime Minister of the country Jawaharlal Nehru appearing frequently as the voice-over continued recounting the horrors of the partition.

"Those who had no knowledge of India's cultural heritage, civilisation, values, pilgrimages, in just three weeks, they drew the border between people living together for centuries", the video said.

Another JeM militant arrested by ATS

 $T^{\text{he sleuths of the Anti-}}_{\text{Terrorists Squad claimed to}}$ have made further successes when they arrested a 19-yearold man for allegedly having links with terror group Jaish-e-Mohammed and being in touch with handlers in Pakistan and Afghanistan through social

The arrest of Habibul Islam alias Saifullah by the ATS comes close on the heels of the arrest of Mohammad Nadeem (25), an alleged terrorist linked to Jaish-e-Mohammed who was tasked with carrying out a 'fidayeen' attack on suspended Bharatiya Janata Party spokesperson Nupur Sharma.

Based on the interrogation of Mohammad Nadeem, who was arrested from Saharanpur

on Friday, a field unit of Kanpur has arrested Habibul Islam alias Saifullah (19). Habibul has admitted that he knows Nadeem and both are connected with terror link JeM," the ATS claimed here on

"Following Nadeem's interrogation, Saifullah was brought from Fatehpur to Kanpur. He was later arrested. Saifullah admitted that he knew Nadeem and both of them were linked to JeM," the UP ATS said in a statement on Sunday.

Indian and international links of Saifullah are being probed and he has been booked under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, Additional Director General of Police (ATS) Naveen Arora said here on Sunday.

According to the police,

Fatehpur district, is a native of Bihar's Motihari district. "Saifullah is an expert in making virtual IDs and he provided around 50 of those to Nadeem as well as terrorists in Pakistan and in Afghanistan. He was linked to handlers in Pakistan and Afghanistan through various social media platforms like Telegram, WhatsApp and Facebook Messenger," the ATS said.

Saifullah, who was residing in

Saifullah is linked to various groups on social media which he used to share 'jihadi videos', the police alleged, adding that he used to send "jihadi videos to people to motivate them".

The ATS has also alleged that a Pakistani handler of the JeM had asked Saifullah to come to Pakistan for "jihadi training" and then 'carry out jihad in India". A mobile phone, a SIM card and a knife have been seized from him, the ATS disclosed.

It may be noted that Mohammad Nadeem, who allegedly has links with Jaishe-Mohammad (JeM) and Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), was arrested by the ATS from Saharanpur on

The ATS spokesman said, "Mohammad Nadeem, a resident of Gangoh in Saharanpur district, has been arrested. During interrogation Nadeem revealed that he was planning a 'fidayeen' attack on a government building or police premises.'

He was also tasked to eliminate BJP suspended spokesperson Nupur Sharma.

Oppn leaders clueless about political realignment in UP

Bihar, the leaders are clueless about political realignment in the state ahead of the 2024 Lok Sabha election.

The wisdom has dawned on the opposition parties that defeating the BJP in UP, which sends 80 MPs to the Lok Sabha, is key to oust the saffron party from power at the Centre but they have no clue how to move forward for achieving this

The BJP's ascendency to power coincided with the dramatic increase in its tally in UP from 10 seats in the 2009 Lok Sabha election to 71 in 2014 and 62 in 2019. The Samajwadi Party, the main opposition party in UP, tried different alliances in the 2017 UP Assembly polls, 2019 Lok Sabha election and 2022 UP Assembly polls, but

all ended in a disaster.

The SP in the 2017 UP Assembly polls Even as the opposition parties in Uttar Pradesh are upbeat over the exit of Bharatiya Janata Party from power in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, the SP formed a grand alliance with its arch rival Bahujan Samaj Party and the Rashtriya Lok Dal and fought the 2022 assembly polls in alliance with the RLD and some other parties, but failed to dent the BJP's electoral supremain the state.

On Tuesday, when Nitish Kumar announced quitting the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance and joining hands with the Rashtriya Janata Dal to form the government in Bihar, SP supremo Akhilesh Yadav welcomed the decision.

"This is a good beginning today, the day when the slogan of 'Bharat chhodo' (Quit India) was given against the British. If the slogan of 'BJP bhagao' (drive away the BJP) is coming from Bihar, I feel that in other states also, parties will stand up against the BJP and so will the people," he

But his party has not expressed any intent to work for a similar realignment in home state Samaiwadi Pa spokesperson Rajendra Chaudhary said the SP was capable of defeating the BJP and it would not enter into an alliance with the BSP led by Mayawati.

"The ŚP will fight elections on its own," Chaudhary said.

Suheldev Bhartiya Samaj Party president Om Prakash Rajbhar said, "If Akhilesh Yadav and Mayawati want the welfare of Dalits and Backwards then they will have to come together. If this is not done then BJP will win all 80 seats in UP in the Lok Sabha election."

Rajbhar had allied with the BJP in the 2017 UP Assembly polls and was an ally of the SP in 2022 UP Assembly polls and has since parted company with the Samajwadi Party.

App for assisting kids with dyslexia and dysgraphia

team from the Indian Institute of A team from the finding flacture A Technology (IIT) Kanpur has developed a novel application for assisting children diagnosed with dyslexia and dysgraphia. The invention named Assistive Application for Children with Dyslexia and Dysgraphia (AACDD) is invented by Prof Braj Bhushan and Prof Shatarupa Thakurta Roy from the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, IIT Kanpur, and Dr Alok Bajpai, a practising psychiatrist from Kanpur. The application comes embedded with a device that helps children learn eas-

Dyslexia and dysgraphia are neurodevelopmental disorders that are characterised by slow and inaccurate word recognition. Developmental dyslexia causes difficulties with accurate and fluent word recognition and spelling, whereas dysgraphia refers to the inability to write coherently. No two dyslexic students present the same set of symptoms and hence there are many efforts undertaken by researchers to overcome these challenges. According to Indian Paediatrics data, the incidence of dyslexia in Indian primary school children has been reported to be two-18 per cent, dysgraphia 14 per cent, and dyscalculia 5.5 per cent. India is thought to have approximately 90 million people with varying degrees of learning disabilities and an average class in school has about five students with learning disabilities. Thus, such specially-abled children benefit from additional support that allows them to learn and function independently. This assistive technology developed by IIT Kanpur acts as additional sup-port to children with dyslexia and dys-graphia which caters to the services and devices that enable people with learning disorders to accomplish daily tasks, assist them in communication, education, work or recreation activities and ultimately




Image of novel application developed by IIT-K to assist children suffering from dyslexia and dysgraphia.

and enhance their quality of life.

Prof Abhay Karandikar, Director, IIT Kanpur said, "Dyslexia and dysgraphia are two common conditions that may hamper a child's growth in the absence of proper support mechanism to guide them. Hence, this new invention from our team of experts has the potential to be a boon for children diagnosed with these conditions. Also, the inclusion of the Hindi language will provide ease of learning to Hindi-speaking users primarily. This invention amplifies IIT Kanpur's relentless work on multidisciplinary MedTech innovations over the years, and I congratulate the entire team for this." The team of experts developed this novel assistive application by acknowledging the need for additional support required by such special children. It provides a training module currently available in the Hindi language for school-going children help them achieve greater independence between classes I to V. The application is

touchscreen-based interface that involves auditory feedback, putting haptic sensation and motor movement to facilitate the acquisition and reproduction of Hindi letters. Later on it is expected to include other languages as well. The application assists children with a tracing task, where they have to follow a blue and a pink dot to trace Hindi letters. As a child starts tracing from the ters. As a child starts tracing from the blue dot to the pink dot, a yellow line accompanies. The moment the child, especially the ones suffering from dysgraphia, deviates from the tracing area, the yellow line disappears and they are told to restart the task. This constitutes the first level of the application. In level II they are taught geometric patterns of II they are taught geometric patterns of Hindi letters in the form of jigsaw puzzles, and are offered reading through auditory feedback. Level III integrates visual, auditory and haptic inputs to write and understand words. In this level, there are 120 Hindi words with increasing level

Since the other technologies presentavailable use the audio input to bypass the reading problem through text-tospeech, the Assistive Application for hildren with Dyslexia and Dysgraphia (AACDD) from IIT Kanpur is unique in terms of integration of audio, visual and haptic inputs, and retraining the brain networks through manipulation of basic geometric patterns of words - like lines, circles etc. This will also help them improve in the domain where normal kids perform rather than solely bypassing it. The application is also unique in and it. The application is also unique in addressing the Hindi language which covers more than 40 per cent of the Indian population. The novel assistive application is going to be very helpful for the children diagnosed with dyslexia and dysgraphia. Further for its integration of Hindi it is expected to get good response among Hindi-speaking users/parents from India and abroad.

Swami Amar Giri receives death threat

Swami Amar Giri has been given a death threat by some unidentified caller after filing an affidavit to withdraw the FIR in the death of Mahant Narendra Giri, former president of Akhil Bharatiya Akhara Parishad.

According to him, not only pressure is being put on him, but he is also getting threats. After being stripped of the responsibility of the administrator of the Lete Hanuman temple, he said on Saturday that if security is not provided, his condition may be the same as that of Bade Maharaj (Mahant Narendra Giri). Swami Amar Giri's troubles

have started increasing after he filed an affidavit to withdraw the case before the High Court. He is scared that something untoward might happen to him as well. After his removal from the post of administrator of Bade Hanuman temple, his round-the-clock surveillance has been increased. In his place, the arrangement of the oig Hanuman temple has now been handed over to Deepak Pujari. Deepak Pujari is now keeping the accounts of receipts of donations and offerings in the Hanuman temple. Along with this, Deepak Pujari is also arranging the items for bhog, puja, aarti etc of the tem-

The new arrangement is being done under the supervi-

sion of Mahant Balveer Giri. The account of the donation box is also being deposited directly in the Baghambari Math under the new system. As the new administrator, Deepak Pujari is putting the receipts of donors on the register. This was confirmed by Swami Amar Giri. On Saturday, Amar Giri enumerated his difficulties. Swami Amar Giri said his life is in danger. According to Swami Amar Giri, his appointment to the post of administrator of Bade Hanuman temple was done by Bade Maharaj during his lifetime. In his suicide note also, it has been written that the responsibility of the administrator of the temple should be given to him i.e. Amar Giri only. Amar Giri says that in such a situation, he cannot be removed from the post of administrator of the Hanuman temple. The efforts being made to create

pressure are wrong.

CASE REGISTERED: Some anti-social elements have uprooted the notice board of property which was attached by Prayagraj Police under the Gangsters Act. Pooramafti police registered a case against nine persons, including jailed block pramukh and notorious cow smuggler Muzaffar. The FIR was filed on the written complainant of constable Yogesh Kumar posted in Bamrauli outpost. Inspector Puramufti

Upendra Pratap Singh said as soon as action under Gangsters Act intensified, Akram, brother of block pramukh and cow smuggler Muzaffar sold a plot to his relative, Mohd Saif of Chafri Nawabganj. The plot at Bamrauli Upahar was also confiscated on August 5, 2022 on the orders of DM. A notice board related to confiscation was also put up on the plot. However, some people uprooted the board and occupied the land. The investigation revealed that there was a conspiracy with jailed Muzaffar. A case has been registered against Muzaffar and his brother Aslam, Anwar alias Bhendu, Azam, Muazzam, Ashraf alias Chhotey, Javed and relative Mohd Saif. Further action will be taken after examining the case.

Meanwhile, the difficulties of Mafia Atique Ahmed will not be reduced. Now preparations are on to destroy the mafia empire completely. Police is now engaged in scouting the illegal properties of Atique in other districts of the state as well as in other states. After tracing these properties they will also be attached under the Gangsters Act. Police are tracing those close to the mafia, who know about these illegal properties.

When the police had arrested the special operatives of mafia Atiq Ahmed in 2020 information about Atique Ahmed's benami properties had started coming. It was learnt that Atique Ahmed has properties in Prayagraj and other districts, including Kaushambi, Pratapgarh, Lucknow, Fatehpur, Kanpur and Sultanpur. Police had got information about mafia's flat in Ahmedabad, Gujarat. When his henchmen used to go to Ahmedabad jail to meet the mafia, they used to stay in the same flat. Whether this flat is in the name of mafia or someone else was not known. The police also asked many of his close relatives about it but failed to get any success. The talk of benami properties has also come to the fore in Mumbai, Delhi and Goa. Now all these benami properties are being traced by the police in a confidential manner. Along with this, the details of his illegal properties in other districts of the state are also being collected.

Ashraf, younger brother of mafia Atiq Ahmed, was questioned by the police after his arrest. If sources are to be believed, he had informed the police about many benami properties. However, he could not reveal anything about the benami properties in whose name.

He was also not able to tell in which district and state where the properties are.

India survives

India has proved the doomsayers wrong; it has progressed a lot in the last 75 years, but it has to do a lot more

he Narendra Modi Government is celebrating the 75the anniversary of Independence with massive fanfare, calling it Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. Patriotism is in the air quite literally—as competing with the Prime Minister in the display of tiranga is Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal. Then there are intellectuals, most of them Leftliberal, who are sullenly watching the march of Modi's nationalism which they intensely dislike. But if one objectively looks at the three quarters of a century of India as an Independent nation, one has to recognise that, despite all the failings and shortcomings, it has been a successful journey. The very fact that our nation still has the same boundaries and the same Constitution is itself a very comforting fact. When India became Independent, not many people in the world gave much of a chance to it to survive for too long as a democratic republic; and the fears and misgivings were real, not the results of conspiracy theories. It was a poor country, beset with all kinds of problems; it was even struggling to feed its teeming millions—a situation that continued for more than



two decades after Independence. From the net per capita availability of food-grains ranging from 127 to 145 kg in 1946, it was 180.3 kg in 2018. Life expectancy was just 31 years, which has now crossed 70 years. The infant mortality and maternal mortality rates were very high, while education levels were very low.

Besides, there were mind-boggling diversity and divisive forces; apart from the eternal bane of caste, there were Hindu-Muslim communal tensions, militant regional/sub-nationalist movements, and other disruptive elements. But India survived in the early years, which was attributed to the towering personality of Jawaharlal Nehru, so people asked 'who after

Nehru.' He died 58 years ago, the years in which the country faced humungous problems, from the Malthusian prospects in the 1960s to a brush with dictatorship (the Emergency, 1975-77) to militancy in Punjab and jihadist separatism in Kashmir to economic crisis in 1991. But India has not perished, neither as a nation nor as a democratic republic. This is not to say that all is well with our democracy and our republic. Our democracy has been weakened by several insidious mechanisms, the prominent among them being the anti-defection law. The republic has been undermined by all governments by way of introducing illiberal changes in the Constitution itself, beginning with the First Amendment in 1951, which curtailed the Fundamental Rights to Freedom of Expression and Property; the later eventually ceased to be a Fundamental Right, getting reduced to a legal right. Similarly, while a lot of economic development has taken place in the last 75 years, India remains a poor country; with its per capita income around \$2,300, its rank in the world is 144. India has progressed a lot in the last 75 years, but it has to do a lot more.



A cowardly attack

Attack on Salman Rushdie opens up the debate on banning books in a democratic society

n a shocking incident, author Salman Rushdie was stabbed 10 times at an event in New York and was seriously injured. The attacker Hadi Matar follows Shia extremists on social media and is an admirer of Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard (IRGC). He has pleaded not guilty. Rushdie's book 'The Satanic Verses, published in 1988 was considered by Muslim clerics as disrespectful of Islam and the Prophet Mohammad. The novel led to a fatwa, a religious decree, by Iran's leader Ayatollah Khomeini. The threat forced him into hiding for several years. The author is likely to survive but may lose one eye. He was stabbed 10 times at Chautauqua Institution, where Rushdie was



about to speak at the event. The suspect rushed onstage and stabbed him before being wrestled to the ground by staff and other people in the audience. Many world leaders condemned the attack and called it vicious and cowardly.

Back home, the Congress is drawing flak for banning the book. Rajiv Gandhi-led Congress Government was quick to ban the book on the pretext of disturbing law and order. Indeed banning a book or for that matter any work of art is tantamount to negating the very premise of democracy, to give everyone space to speak and express himself without any fear. However, certain reasonable restrictions apply. For

instance, no sane society would allow books promoting child pornography or violent actions or drug abuse. Being blasphemous is a little different. It is debatable and should be debated within the boundaries of blasphemy. Satanic Verses is not the only book banned in free India. 'Rama Retold' or 'Ramayana', a spoof of the Ramayana by Aubrey Menen, was banned in 1955. 'The land of Lingam' 1937 Arthur Miles is still banned for being critical of Hinduism and phallic worship. 'Rangila Rasul', 1924, which dealt with Prophet Mohammad's relationships is banned to date. 'The Jewel in the Lotus', 1968 by Allen Edwardes for being oriental erotica The list is long; it even includes 'The Da Vinci Code', banned in Nagaland for its uncharitable comments on Jesus, and 'An Area of Darkness' by Nobel prize winner VS Naipaul, and even classic DH Lawrence's Lady Chatterley's Lovers. The books are frozen thoughts and when they melt in the reader's mind, they trigger a thought process. Needless to say, it depends upon the maturity of the individual or society if it can handle it. We can judge for ourselves how mature we are. We cannot be selective in banning books. Let there be a debate about it.

The damage done to India's image over the years was far greater.

An expert on Strategy: Edward Luttwak years ago innovated the concept of Armed Suation which, if pursued, would make one's country appear stronger than it was. They can be proprietary, partnerships, or limited to certain types of people. They can be constituted by people who have invested money in them, and the list can go on.

Besides the types of categories listed in the preceding paragraphs, there can be other types of institutions. The purpose of this text is not to focus on the types of institutions that exist or can exist. The purpose is to highlight how the institutions work. Conventionally this role is performed by a statutory body or a federating body, which decides the method of work. A statutory body determining how institutions work would have a legal status duly enshrined by the process of approval of the statutory body itself, in a legislative system. This legislative system can be an Assembly or a Parliament. Somewhere, a legal framework would come in. The important thing is to understand how it would all work. It is a method of work which will ultimately decide the probity, or indeed, the effectiveness, of the system.



There is a moral dimension also, because in the ultimate analysis, unless it is a private single proprietary ownership, every contributing stream of people who provide money and resources to the organization has a right to know how the institution they have provided money to, is functioning. There is a need to think about corrective measures. There is also a need to ensure that a basic commonsensical fair play is at the root of the institution. It is the system of monitoring which is at the core of organizational and institutional effectiveness. It is here where empirical data on orderly and deviant institutions becomes necessary. So far, it has been the responsibility of the consensus of the social segment where this institution is embedded to determine this. Thus, it is that the general public opinion becomes determinant of ultimate efficacy of the functioning of the institutions. In this the media plays an important role, because it has the responsibility of spreading facts and contributing to a healthy and fair opinion system. Internal leadership of the institution plays a crucial role, because between a flagrant violation of institutional probity and a very rigid form of framework of the institution lies the space for judgment and processes. When it comes to process, there are several indicators of assessing how well or not so well the institution is working. These process issues can be listed, enumerated, and explained. There can be several of them, including size of the institutional bodies, the focus of their sub-objective within the overall objective; how the central figure in that unit is identified, and the list can go on. For purposes of illustration, one could just focus on defining the objectives of the sub-body or indeed, the number of times it meets.

To begin at the top, just the number of times the board of an organization meets is a good example. In streams of organization, say, in education where the statutory systems are not equally rigorously articulated aberration can take place. There have been cases of several educational institutions where the Governing Body neither meets regularly nor for a given span of time. There have been examples in national chains where a newly set up institution in that chain did not meet for as much as nine months. It did not bother anyone particularly. To put it more simply, for the healthy running of institutions, there is a need to establish, observable, actionable, and cognizable method of work.

Indian democracy must become attractive to skilled people such as those who have domain expertise

ast month, the YSR Congress elected Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Jagan Mohan Reddy as its chief for lifetime. In China, Xi Jinping has such credentials. India is a democracy. China is a one party nation and a totalitarian state. What kind of democracy the YSR Congress fosters is not just the business of Jagan Mohan Reddy, but also of those who have stakes in the Indian democracy.

The president of the Rashtriya Janata Dal has invariably been from within the Lalu Prasad Yadav family. Same is the case with the Samajwadi Party. Similar is the story of the Shiromani Akali Dal, the Shiv Sena, the Telangana Rashtra Samithi, and some others. On a closer look, the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam also fits in the same slot. Even the Congress presents no different story in the last few decades.

The Representation of the People's Act has failed to stop some political parties becoming family-owned enterprises. India abolished the practice of Zamindari in 1951. Yet, their political avatars have mushroomed in many states, carving out territories by cashing in on identity politics, to imprison democracy to a few families.

At a time when India celebrates 75 years of Independence, while the world applauds the depth and diversity of democracy, lawmakers must introspect that under their watch the political zamindari has taken a large space, which should have otherwise been with the genuine leaders, who would have come from the political grinding to command leadership of a large base of the

That makes it incumbent for radical reforms to be carried out immediately by holding discussions with stakeholders in a time-bound manner to blank out any prospect of any family usurping a political

To put this to effect, the RPA Act can be suitably amended to prohibit a person from holding more than two terms of the post of the president of a political party. It should also be ensured that when that person leaves the post, it cannot be held by anyone who has family relations with him for not less than 10 years.

There is no denying the fact that politics in the country has become more caste-centric. This calls for a review of the reserved seats for the Lok Sabha, State Assemblies, Zila Panchayat and Local Bodies. Why should only a scheduled caste or tribe politician represent a reserved seat, and what stops a general category politician from working for such constituencies who have been disadvantaged for decades.

The Directive Principle of the Constitution and the teachings of Mahatma Gandhi call for social amity, and politics is the foremost means of achieving such aims. The aims for Samajik Samrasta (social inclusiveness) make it incumbent to shuffle reserved seats without attaching them to demographic profile, while also not impacting on the number of such seats. This will bring true inclusiveness. This will make the

also take a closer look at the participation of women, scheduled caste and tribe leaders in all wings of democracy, and statutorily ensure that anomalies are addressed.

More than 90 per cent of the political workers are not known to have any means of livelihood. Still, they aren't seen begging anywhere, and rather they move around in sports vehicles. This is the story from Gram Panchayat to State capitals and the national capital. People don't pay much attention to their means of income, taking for granted that they must be hailing from well-off family backgrounds.

This brings to the attention the backgrounds of the likes of Akhilesh Yadav or Aditya Thackeray, for there's no public records to show their sources of incomes to justify their lavish lifestyles. They are prominent names of Indian politics, but there would be millions of political workers who never had enough education to find jobs and so they found it convenient to join politics.

This is indeed India's paradox that we aspire for the country to be free from corruption but the life and breath of democracy are ensured by an army of workers who have no known sources of incomes. They may engage in ways which may not be appropriate for their livelihoods, while also incurring necessary expenditure on behalf of their political parties.

This again calls for deep reforms in electoral politics, and we should not be apologetic to admit that we need to pay a respectable salary to a political worker who is working full time. This salary has to be paid by political parties, but they have to be bound under the suitable law, which should be auditable by a government agency, with the oversight to be vested with the Election Commission. That will be the serious attempt to get rid of political corruption, as it will also pave the way for a close monitoring of the assets of the political leaders.

Additionally, the Election Commission must breathe fresh air and admit that there is no rational-Lok Sabha and the Assembly elections, and also on the grounds of the geography, as well as the size of the constituencies. There must be rationalization of expenditure ceilings, for this again is a ground for massive electoral corruption, as dummy candidates are put up to cover additional expenses of candidates, besides also being the reasons for more vices in the election system in the country.

In the 1990s, the political leaders brainstormed about India of the 21st century. We have been two decades old in the 21st century and our electoral democracy remains rugged and outdated, not rising to the challenges of the new era, where the people are educated, besides being aspirational, along with India aiming to take a prominent position on the high table in the international arena.

Until we shake off the dust that the electoral democracy has gathered over several decades, no genuine gains can go to the deserving people. India at 75 must ensure that anyone with fire in his or her belly to serve the nation can join politics without worrying for his or her livelihood and progress in politics.

Indian pharmaceutical industry poised to take off

Presently, the Indian pharma industry caters to more than 60 per cent of the global demand for different vaccines as well as ARV drug supplies, 30 per cent of UNICEF's annual supply worldwide and almost 60-80 per cent of UN purchases of medicines come from

further heights.

Additionally, India also contributes nearly 57 per cent of APIs and 69 per cent of FPP (Finished Pharma Products) to the WHO's Pre-Qualified list. Furthermore, about 40 per cent of generics drug requirements in the US are met by India. All this is possible due to various initiatives that were taken to boost the domestic pharmaceutical industry. Here's a look at the significant ones that aided in the strong growth of the industry:

The Patent Act, 1970 This was the first patent act introduced after India became independent. It made the way for process patents and restricted patenting of end-products, which enabled manufacturers to develop alternative processes for proprietary products that were already there in the mar-

The Drug Policy, 1978 The introduction of this policy along with the Price Control Order of 1979 turned out to be landmark events for the pharmaceutical industry in India. It not only enabled the setting up of a National Drug Authority but also provided a 'directional push' to the sector. The policy aimed at increasing the local production of bulk drugs, providing leadership to the PSUs, reducing imports of bulk drugs, encouraging the growth of the local industry and reducing the selling prices of important drugs along with their formu-

Hatch-Waxman Act 1984 Even though this Act was passed in the US, it helped in the proliferation of generic drugs and assisted a lot in the growth of the Indian generic industry. The Act established the economic and legal foundation for the presentday generic pharmaceutical

The 1991 economic reforms The Indian government in 1991 launched some major economic reforms and entered the world of globalisation. The economic reforms helped in market liberalisation, linking the Indian

pharmaceutical industry with the world economy. It also ensured the end of the 'License-Raj', which allowed the pharma industry to enjoy more freedom in the market. This created more leverage for domestic players and allowed market competition to produce better products.By liberalising the economy, the government increased business opportunities in the country. As a result, a number of entrepreneurs seized the opportunities and grew their pharma business from a small firm to a big company. Ever since the inception of these reforms, the domestic pharma industry has grown by leaps and bounds and currently exports medicines and drugs worth \$19 billion throughout the world.

Recently, the Cabinet also approved two schemes, namely

the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme and the scheme on Promotion of Bulk Drug Parks, to promote domestic manufacturing of critical key starting materials/drug intermediates and APIs (Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients) in India.

The government has plans develop three mega bulk drug parks in India in partnership with states. A sum of Rs 3,000 crore has been approved for this scheme for the next five years. Under the PLI scheme, financial incentives will be provided to eligible producers of identified 53 critical bulk drugs on their incremental sales over the base year (2019-20) for a period of six years.

The scheme will reduce the country's import dependence for critical KSMs/Drug Intermediates and APIs.

In the recent past, digitisation

has also emerged as a key driver for the pharmaceutical industry, helping to deliver top-quality and hyper-personalized customer experiences and also improving business resilience and performance. Without any doubt, digitisation will play an active role in driving agility across the pharmaceutical value chain by bringing the sector closer to patients and doctors.

Most importantly, the pharma industry must work towards further innovation, by manufacturing effective new medicines/ drugs for emerging and unmet healthcare needs. Steps like these will enable the industry to transform into an innovation hub for the future.

Death cuts short the Big Bull's run at 62

Jhunjhunwala passes away days after launch of his Akasa Air

Billionaire investor, the 'Big Bull' of the Indian market, and Akasa Air co-founder Rakesh Jhunjhunwala passed away on Sunday, following a cardiac arrest.

He was 62 and is survived his wife Rekha Ihunjhunwala and daughter Nishtha and two twin sons Aryaman and Aryaveer.

Ihunihunwala, who was the 36th richest person in the country as per the Forbes' 2021 list and had a net worth of around \$5.8 billion, was brought dead to the Breach Candy Hospital in Mumbai at 6:45 A.M on Sunday.

His health had deteriorat-

ed over the past few weeks, and he was being treated for kidney-related ailments and emic heart disease. The hospital certified that cardiac arrest was the cause of his death. Jhunjhunwala, who had lived his life king size, had several vices. He had gone on record way back in 2013, saying: "I don't have good habits. I smoke like a chimney, drink like a fish, eat like a pig. I don't exercise. Yes. My health worries

He had recently teamed up with ex-Jet Airways CEO Vinay Dube and former IndiGo head Aditya Ghosh to launch Akasa Air, 'a low-cost airline. The airline took to the skies last week. He was seen in a wheelchair at the launch of Akasa Air. The airline currently has two aircrafts with an additional order for 70 more planes and flies to three cities.

In a statement, Akasa Air mourned Jhunjhunwala's death and said that he cared greatly for the well-being of its employees and customers. "Akasa Air will honour his legacy, values and belief in us by striving to run a great airline," a statement issued by Akasa Air said.

Dubbed as "India's Warren Buffett", Jhunjhunwala was



always bullish about the country's stock market. He had made investments in more than three dozen companies. Among the companies where he had made huge investments were Titan, Star Health & Allied Insurance, Metro Brands, CRISIL Ltd, NCC Limited and Tata Motors.

He was also the Chairman of Hungama Digital Media Entertainment Pvt Ltd and Aptech Ltd. He was on the Board of Directors of several companies, including Provogue India Limited, Nagariuna Constructions, Tops Security Ltd and Mid-Day Multimedia Ltd. His privately-owned stock trading firm Rare Enterprises derived its name from the first two letters of his name and that of his investor wife Rekha.

Born on July 5, 1960 Jhunjhunwala grew up in Mumbai, where his father was posted as an Income-Tax officer. After graduating from Sydenham College in 1985, he enrolled at the Institute of Chartered Accountant of India. Ihunjhunwala began investing with Rs 5,000 in 1985 when the Bombay Stock Exchange's benchmark index Sensex was at 150. At the time of death, his investment had grown to Rs 11,000 crore. As of 2021, his biggest investment was in Titan Company which was worth Rs 7.294.8 crore.

Known for his rich lifestyle, Jhunjhunwala -- in 2013 --bought six of the 12 units of Ridgeway apartments at Malabar Hill from Standard Chartered bank for Rs 176 crore. Later in 2017 he bought the other six apartments in the building from HSBC bank for

Rs 195 crore. In 2021 he commenced the construction of his new 70,000 square feet 13 storey home after the demolition of the old building.

Jhunjhunwala was investi-

gated for insider trading. Later on SEBI settled the issue after a total payment of Rs 35 crore from Jhunjhunwala and his associates. Jhunjhunwala paid Rs 18.5 crore, while his wife

paid Rs 3.2 crore.

Mourning the death of
Jhunjhunwala, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the legendary investor "leaves behind an indelible contribution to the financial world."

"Shri Rakesh Ihunihunwala is no more. Investor, bold risk taker, masterly understanding of the stock market, clear in communication - a leader in his own right. Fondly remember several conversations we've had. Had strong belief in India's strength and capabilities. Condolences," Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman tweeted.

Union Minister for Civil Aviation Jyotiraditya Scindia said he will be remembered for giving India its new airline Akasa Air after more than a decade. Paying a rich tribute to Jhunjhunwala, Industrialist Ratan Tata said that the billionaire investor would always be remembered for "his acute understanding of the stock exchanges of India."

"He will also be remembered for his jovial personality, his kindness, and his farsightedness. My heartfelt condolences go out to his family which has to share the burden of this great loss," Ratan Tata

IMD predicts light rains at Red Fort on I-Day morning

New Delhi (PTI): The weather office has forecast light rain and strong winds on Monday morning in the area surrounding the Red Fort where Prime Minister Narendra Modi will hoist the national flag to mark the 76th Independence Day.

In a special forecast, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said the Red Fort area could experience a generally cloudy sky with light rain in the morning hours between 6 AM and 12 noon. "Strong wind occasionally speed reaching 20-30 km per hour likely to prevail during forenoon," the weather forecast said. The minimum temperature on Monday morning was

expected to be in the range of 25-27 degrees Celsius, it said, adding that the mercury could touch 36 degrees Celsius during the day. The weather office has also forecast generally cloudy sky with

light rain over the Red Fort area from Sunday midnight till 6 AM. The weather office started issuing three-hourly nowcast for the region from Sunday afternoon. Parts of the national capital received light rains on Sunday with Palam reporting 10.8 mm rainfall between 8:30 AM and 6:30 PM followed by Lodhi Road and Ridge (6.4 mm each), Pusa (4.5 mm) and Ayanagar (3.1 mm), the weather office said. The maximum temperature reported in the national capital on Sunday was 34 degrees Celsius, while the mercury settled at 27.1 degrees Celsius in the morning.

J-K govt scraps 'discriminatory' rules

Srinagar (PTI): Jammu and Kashmir government on Sunday scrapped the Probationer (Condition of Service, Pay and Allowances) and Fixation Rules, 2020, to bring all employees being appointed on equal-footing in terms of salary and other benefits. The decision was taken by the Administrative Council, which met here under the chairmanship of Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha. The Administrative Council approved the scrapping of Jammu and Kashmir Probationer (Condition of Service, Pay and Allowances) and Fixation Rules, 2020, notified vide S.O. 192 of 2020 (successor of S.O 202 of 2015); with effect from August 1, 2022, an official spokesman said.

The decision will bring all government employees being appointed in the Union territory on an equal footing with their earlier appointed counterparts who may be occupying the same/comparable posts in the cadre, the spokesman said.

Finance Min plans to review exemption-free tax regime

New Delhi: The Finance Ministry is proposing to soon review the exemption-free new tax regime with a view to making it more attractive for individual income taxpayers, sources said.

Eventually, sources said, the Government aims to establish a system where there are no exemptions and the complex old tax regime with exemptions and deductions is terminated.

The Union Budget 2020-21 introduced a new tax regime. Taxpayers were given the option to choose between the old regime with various deductions and exemptions and the new tax regime that offered lower tax rates without exemptions and deductions

The intention behind the move was to provide significant relief to the individual taxpayers and to simplify the incometax law. Asked about the experience of the new tax regime, sources said, there are clear signs that people who have finished their home and education loans are willing to shift to the



new tax regime as they have no exemptions to claim.

Sources further said that lowering of taxes in the new would make the new tax regime more attractive.

A similar tax regime for corporate taxpayers was introduced in September 2019 by significantly lowering rates and removing exemptions.

The Government had announced a cut in base corporate tax for then existing companies to 22 per cent from 30

per cent; and for new manufacturing firms, incorporated after October 1, 2019, and starting operations before March 31, 2024, to 15 per cent from per cent. Companies opting for these new tax rates will have to forego all exemptions and incentives.

Under the new tax regime for individual taxpayers announced on February 1, 2020, people with an annual income of up to ₹2.5 lakh do not pay any tax.

States should not give freebies beyond fiscal capabilities: Kumar

New Delhi: State Governments should not dole out "non-merit freebies" such as gifts and consumer durables beyond their fiscal capabilities, according to former Niti Aayog Vice Chairman Rajiv Kumar.

Kumar noted that there is a difference between merit transfer payment and nonmerit freebies, especially those which are done beyond the fiscal capability of any government. "Non-merit freebies which are the nature of giving out gifts, consumer durables

... Those are to be looked at carefully and in any case should not be undertaken by the governments who have fiscal constraints," he told PTI in an interview.

Noting that in a democracy, transfer pay ments via the government through the instrument of taxation and distribution is always necessary, he said, "any transfer payments whose social rate of return is higher than any private rate of return, in other words which has positive externalities, is worth doing."

On some politicians comparing the current economic situation of Sri Lanka with India. Kumar said, "any such comparison is simply unwarranted and mischievous to different lev-

Sri Lanka is grappling with a severe economic crisis and India has been at the forefront of extending economic assistance to Sri Lanka.



Army Jawan's body buried in Siachen glacier found after thirty eight years

The Army has found the I mortal remains of one of its soldiers after 38 years in the Siachen glacier. The soldier has been identified as Lance Naik Chandra Shekhar. He was reported missing after an avalanche hit his team on the world's highest battlefield.

A patrol team on Saturday found the remains of Shekhar in an old bunker at the Siachen glacier at a height of more than 16,000 feet. An identification disc around the neck of the skeleton helped the army ascertain his identity.


The mishap took place in 1984 shortly after the Indian army was deployed at the Siachen glacier. Shekhar was part of a team asked to capture Point 5965, an important fea-ture that the Pakistanis were eyeing. The 19 Kumaon regiment unit was one of the first

the glacier. Shekhar's unit had halted for the night when an avalanche hit it. Eighteen personnel, including an officer Second Lieutenant P S Pundir, were killed, sources said. While the mortal remains of 14 were found, five were missing.

Shekhar's body was found by a patrol team, they said, adding in summer months the teams fan out at the glacier to locate the missing soldiers.

JeM affiliate PAFF takes responsibility for attack on Army camp

The People's Anti-Fascist Force (PAFF), believed to be an affiliate of Pakistani terror group Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM), has taken responsibility for the attack on an army camp in Rajouri in Jammu early on Thursday in which four soldiers lost their lives and two terrorists were liquidated in the operation.

The PAFF has issued two separate video messages claiming responsibility for the attack and warned of more such attacks to achieve its objective of internationalizing the Kashmir issue.

In one of the videos, a man with his face blurred warns to escalate attacks against the security forces which he dubbed as "Hindutva Forces".

'With Rajouri attack, we began such an operation. We will gradually calibrate to such a level that the international community knows that Kashmir is still a war zone," the man in the video warned.

The outfit further warned that it is determined to not allow India to conduct any G-20 meeting in Kashmir and that it will do anything and everything to stop this.

Besides hard military attacks, the outfit has exhorted the Kashmiri diaspora to raise the issue diplomatically and engage as many foreign governments as possible to highlight the issue.

"Among the majority of the 347 Gallantry Awards, 204 personnel are being awarded for their gallant action in Jammu & Kashmir, 80 personnel for their gallant action in Left Wing Extremism affected areas, and 14 personnel for their gallant action in North-East Region.

Among the personnel receiving Gallantry Awards, 109 are from CRPF, 108 are from J&K Police, 19 are from BSF, 42 are from Maharashtra, 15 are from Chhattisgarh, and the remaining from the other States/UTs and CAPFs," said

Among them, 347 have been awarded police medal for gallantry (PMG), 87 President's police medal for distinguished service, and 648 given police medals for meritorious ser-

Out of the 347 gallantry awards, 204 personnel are being awarded for their gallant action in Jammu and Kashmir, 80 for displaying bravery in Left Wing Extremism or Naxal violenceaffected areas, and 14 personnel for showing bravery in North-East Region, the Union

Home Ministry said. CRPF IGs Padmakar Santu Ranpise, Rajesh Kumar, CISF IG Hem Raj Gupta, SSB IGs Pankaj Kumar Darad, Pradeep Kumar Gupta, BSF IG Bhupendra Kumar Mehta, and DIGs Indraj Singh, Kamaljit Singh Banyal, Binay Kumar Jha were among the 87 persons won the President's Police Medals for

Within the state police forces, 42 gallantry medals have been given to Maharashtra, 15 to Chhattisgarh for the anti-Maoist operations.

Ghulam Rasool Bhat, Jatinder Singh, Faiz Mohd, and Allah Din Khatana of the Jammu and Kashmir Police have been awarded the Police Medal for Gallantry for their counter-terrorism operation on March 23, 2021, in the Shopian district that saw protests from

Seven decades after Partition, 94-yr-old woman recalls carnage, rebuilding life from scratch

There was bloodshed every-where... Every other perthe loss of a loved one," says 94year-old Kailash Rani, recalling the day she and her family were forced to flee their home in Pakistan's Rawalpindi during Partition.

"Some of our close relatives accompanying us were killed in cold blood by some youths," Rain said heré on Sunday. The independence of India from British colonial rule in 1947 coincided with Partition that triggered widespread communal violence and resulted in an insurmountable refugee crisis.

Rani said her husband, Suraj Prakash, a businessman, faced communal violence and mindless hate before the family decided to leave Rawalpindi for somewhere safe.

"We were well settled and our family was very prosperous living in a posh colony there. Suddenly, riots erupted and we were forced to leave," the nonagenarian said. She said the situation was so bad at that time that they could not take any

"We buried all our gold house hoping to collect them after a few years once the situation would return to normal."Unfortunately, we have not been able to visit our ancestral house in 75 years. We don't even know if our house in Rawalpindi still exists," she

Rani said she and her family managed to reach the railway station and boarded a train headed to India."There was chaos, fear and looting on the train. The train was overloaded with refugees. Thank God we reached Ambala safely," she said.

Like millions of others who were displaced during Partition, Rani and her family members had to rebuild their lives from scratch.

Initially, they lived in tents along with other families at Baldev Nagar Camp in Ambala city."Later, we were shifted to mud houses.

More US lawmakers visiting Taiwan twelve days after Pelosi trip

ships and warplanes into the seas and skies around Taiwan for several days afterward. The Chinese government objects to Taiwan having any official contact with foreign governments, particularly with a highranking congressional leader like Pelosi.

A Taiwanese broadcaster showed video of a U.S. Government plane landing about 7 p.M. Sunday at Songshan Airport in Taipei, the Taiwanese capital. While it wasn't confirmed who was on board, the American Institute issued a brief statement soon after announcing the delegation would be in Taiwan on Sunday

Officials: Fire at Coptic church in Cairo kills 41, injures 14

A fire ripped through a packed church during morning services in Egypt's capital on Sunday, killing at least 41 worshippers and injuring 14.

The church quickly filled with thick black smoke, and witnesses said several trapped congregants jumped from upper floors to escape. "Suffocation, suffocation, all of them dead," said a distraught witness, who only gave a partial name, Abu Bishoy.

The cause of the blaze in the Abu Sefein

church in the working-class neighbourhood of Imbaba was not immediately known. An initial investigation pointed to an electrical short-circuit, according to a police statement.

Footage from the scene circulated

online showed burned furniture, including wooden tables and chairs. Firefighters were seen putting out the blaze while others carried victims to ambulances. Families waited for word on relatives who were inside the

Witnesses said there were many children inside the building when the fire broke out. "There are children we didn't know how to get to them," said Abu Bishoy. "And we don't know whose son this is, or whose

daughter that is. Is this possible? The country's health minister blamed the smoke and a stampede as people attempted to flee the fire for causing the fatalities. It was one of the worst fire tragedies

in Egypt in recent years. Witness Emad Hanna said the church includes two places used as a daycare for children, and that a church worker managed to get many children out.

"We went upstairs and found people dead. And we started to see from outside that the smoke was getting bigger, and people want to jump from the upper floor. ... We found the children."

Egypt's Coptic Church and the country's health ministry reported the casualty toll. The church said the fire broke out while



a service was underway. The church is located in a narrow street in one of the most densely populated neighbourhoods in Cairo.

Fifteen firefighting vehicles were dispatched to the scene to put out the flames while ambulances ferried casualties to nearby hospitals, officials said.

President Abdel Fattah el-Sissi spoke by phone with the Coptic Christian Pope Tawadros II to offer his condolences, the president's office said. Sheikh Ahmed al-Tayeb, Al-Azhar's Grand Imam, also offered his condolences to the head of the Coptic

"I am closely following the develop-ments of the tragic accident," el-Sissi wrote on Facebook. "I directed all concerned state agencies and institutions to take all necessarv measures, and immediately to deal with this accident and its effects.

Health Minister Khaled Abdel-Ghafar said in a statement that two of the injured were discharged from a hospital while 12 others were still being treated.

The Interior Ministry said it received a report on the fire at 9 a.M. Local time, and that they found that the blaze broke out in an air conditioner in the building's second

The ministry, which oversees police and firefighters, blamed an electrical short-circuit for the fire, which produced huge amounts of smoke. Meanwhile, the country's chief prosecutor, Hamada el-Sawy, ordered an investigation and a team of prosecutors were dispatched to the

Later on Sunday, emergency services said they managed to put out the blaze and the prime minister and other senior government officials arrived to inspect the site.

Egypt's Christians account for some 10% of the nation's more than 103 million people and have long complained of discrimination by the nation's Muslim major-

Sunday's blaze was one of the worst fire tragedies in recent years in Egypt, where safety standards and fire regulations are poorly enforced. In March last year, a fire at a garment factory near Cairo killed at least 20 people and injured 24 more.



Despite public resentment, no progress in Iraq political deadlock

Weeks after followers of an influential cleric stormed parliament, Iraq's political crisis shows no signs of abating, despite rising public anger over a debilitating gridlock that has further weakened the country's caretaker government and its ability to provide basic services.

Iraq's two rival Shiite political camps remain locked in a zero-sum competition, and the lone voice potentially able to end the rift - the revered Grand Ayatollah Ali al-Sistani - has been conspicuously silent.

For now, hundreds of supporters of Muqtada al-Sadr, a firebrand Shiite cleric, are still camped outside the legislative building in Baghdad, ready to escalate if their demands are not met.

Al-Sadr has called for early elections, the dissolution of parliament and constitutional amendments. He has given the judiciary an end-of-the-week deadline to dissolve the legis-

His Shiite rivals in the Iran-backed camp have conditions of their own. They accused him of violating the constitution, prompting counter-protests that have spurred fears of bloodshed.

Gunman wounds 8 in late-night Jerusalem shooting

The shooting happened as the bus waited in a parking lot near the Western Wall, the holiest site where Jews can

Israeli police said forces were dispatched to the scene to investigate. Israeli security forces also pushed into the nearby Palestinian neighbourhood of Silwan pursuing the suspected attacker.

Later on Sunday, police said the suspected attacker turned himself in. Police did not immediately disclose details about the suspected attacker's

The attack in Jerusalem followed a tense week between Israel and Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank.

Last weekend, Israeli aircraft unleashed an offensive in the Gaza Strip targeting the militant group Islamic Jihad and setting off three days of fierce cross-border fighting. Islamic Jihad fired hundreds of rockets during the flare-up to avenge the airstrikes, which killed two of its commanders and other militants. Israel said the attack was meant to thwart threats from the group to respond to the arrest of one of its officials in the occupied West Bank.

Forty-nine Palestinians, including 17 children and 14 militants, were killed, and several hundred were injured in the fighting, which ended with an Egyptian-brokered ceasefire. No Israeli was killed or seri-

ously injured. The Islamic militant group Hamas, which controls Gaza, stayed on the sidelines.

A day after the cease-fire halted the worst round of Gaza fighting in more than a year, Israeli troops killed three Palestinian militants and wounded dozens in a shootout that erupted during an arrest raid in the West Bank city of

Truss in commanding lead over Sunak in UK PM race

The UK prime ministerial race frontrunner, Foreign Secretary Liz Truss, continues to hold on to a commanding 22point lead over former Chancellor Rishi Sunak in the Conservative Party leadership contest, according to a new survey of Tory members on Sunday.

In an Opinium poll for The Observer newspaper of 570 Conservative members with a vote in the election, Truss is on 61 per cent and the British Indian former minister is on 39 per cent. With under three weeks to go before the September 2 deadline for postal and online votes to be cast by the membership to elect a successor to outgoing Prime Minister Boris Johnson, Sunak seems to have closed the gap only slight-

ly in recent days. "From the moment we knew the final two candidates, it has been clear that Truss has had all the momentum, and our latest poll sets out just how large her lead among the party members has become," Chris Curtis of Opinium told the newspaper.

ing already returned their ballot papers, it is now very unlikely Truss won't become Prime Minister in September. It's clear that Sunak's biggest problem is



trust. While some members respect his economic arguments, this hasn't been enough to overcome the view among members that he isn't honest or trustworthy enough for the top job, particularly after he called for Johnson to go," he said. Opinium's detailed ques-

tioning also uncovers a striking lack of enthusiasm for either candidate when members are asked whether they would prefer one of them to Johnson to run the party and country. When offered the choice of Johnson still being in No. 10 Downing Street, or Truss taking over, around 63 per cent of Tory members polled said they would prefer Johnson to be still in charge against 22 per cent who wanted Truss. On the other side, 68 per cent said they would prefer to still have Johnson than see him replaced by Sunak, who was preferred by just 19 per

The poll also found that almost three in 10 of the Tory electorate (29 per cent) had already voted. Some 47 per cent said they would definitely be voting for the candidate they had opted for. Just 19 per cent said they had yet to make up their

Friday morning".

Opinium said that while these findings meant it may still be possible for Sunak to pull off "stunning comeback" to enter 10 Downing Street, but to do so he would have to win over almost all the undecideds and convert a sizeable chunk of those not fully behind Truss.

The Foreign Secretary's support is particularly strong among older Conservative members, while Sunak's is far higher among younger ones. For Sunak the most cited reason was that he would be better at managing the economy (22 per cent), while 10 per cent said they regarded him as the most competent or intelligent.

A main reason mentioned by people who backed Truss was dislike of Sunak (14 per cent). The same proportion (14 per cent) said the Cabinet minister was more honest and trustworthy, while 10 per cent chose the fact that she had remained loyal to Johnson and not called on him to resign.

Mexico President to bypass Congress to keep army in streets

m exico}$'s president has begun exploring plans to sidestep congress to hand formal control of the National Guard to the army, a move that could extend the military's control over policing in a country with high levels of violence. That has raised concerns because President Andrés Manuel López Obrador won approval for creating the force in 2019 by pledging in the constitution that it would be under nominal civilian control and that the army would be off the streets by 2024.

Neither the National Guard nor the military have been able to lower the insecurity in the country, however.

west cities in a bold challenge to the state. Still, López Obrador wants to keep soldiers involved in policing, and remove civilian control over the National Guard, whose officers and commanders are mostly soldiers, with military training and

votes in congress to amend the constitution and has suggested he may try to do it as a regulatory change with a simple majority in congress or by an executive order and see if the courts will uphold that. López Obrador warned Friday against politicising the issue, saying the military is needed to fight Mexico's violent drug cartels.

clinched the ODI series against them 2-1, cheered on by a full house of home supporters.

Left-handed middle-order batter Ryan Burl was one of the main architects in Zimbabwe's T20I series win over Bangladesh at Harare.

From 76/6, Burl slammed 34 runs off Nasum Ahmed in the 15th over, equalling the record for the second-most runs hit in an over in T20I cricket. He eventually made 54 and shared a crucial stand of 79 with Luke Jongwe to set the base for a memorable Zimbabwe vic-

Burl, who had missed the 2016 series against India due to a tear in his ACL (Anterior Cruciate Ligament) in the left knee, is excited about the prospect of playing against the KL Rahul-led side.

He spoke to IANS about the upcoming ODI series against India, influence of head coach Dave Houghton on Zimbabwe's turnaround and what qualifying for the T20 World Cup means for the side.

On being asked how he looks at upcoming ODI series against India after T20 World Cup qualification, and winning the T20I and ODI series against Bangladesh, the batsman said, "We would like to try and win the series. How we do that, I don't mind that as long as we get the wins. But it's India and one of the best teams in the world. They are not going to put up an easy fight; it's going to be difficult. Hopefully, with our home ground advantage, we can try and pull out a cat out of the hat and put out something special."
