According to the IMD, heavy rainfall is predicted over several parts of the State as cyclone 'Mandous' over the Bay of Bengal is expected to cross the coast between the Union Territory of Puducherry, and Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh,

"As of now, there are no heavy rains. Collectors of the six districts which are expected to receive heavy rainfall due to the cyclone have been alerted and control rooms also been opened," B.R Ambedkar, director of the State Disaster Management, said.

"Five NDRF and another five SDRF teams have been kept ready.



We are also ready to evacuate people in case of emergency," he further said. Cyclone alert messages have been sent through common alert protocol (CAP) to as many as 89 lakh subscribers spread across the six districts which are likely to be affected due to heavy rains during December 8-10, according to official information.

Gujarat mandate magic of 'Modi model' of development

t a time when some political parties in the country are resorting to the nastiest of tricks to continue in power for a second or third term in a row, Bharatiya Janata Party has won people's mandate in Gujarat for a record seventh term with its quintessential inclusive development approach - Sabka Saath Sabka Vikas. This mantra, scrupulously followed by the Modi sarkar at the Center and by all BJP-ruled states, including Gujarat, worked wonders for the party with a difference.

The Bharatiya Janata Party secured an absolute majority, with 52.5% vote share, and a record-breaking 156 seats in 182-seat Gujarat Assembly, breaking the previous record of 149 seats - won by the Congress in 1985.

What makes this mandate even more extraordinary is its pro-incumbency nature for a party that has been in power continuously for the past 24

A quick scan of the detailed

results tells us that the BJP's candidates bagged 90% of the seats reserved for SCs and STs. Twenty four out of 27 segments reserved for Scheduled Tribes candidates went to the BJP. For instance, the BJP's Mohan Konkani won Vyara, a tribal seat that the Congress had won for four consecutive terms in the Tapi district, by defeating the sitting MLÁ Punabhai Gamit. The Vyara seat is considered a key Assembly seat because it gave Gujarat its first tribal CM, Amarsinh Chaudhary.

Of the 13 Assembly segments reserved for Scheduled the BJP's Mohan Konkani won Vyara, a tribal seat that the Congress had won for four consecutive terms in the Tapi district, by defeating the sitting MLA Punabhai Gamit. The Vyara seat is considered a key Assembly seat because it gave Gujarat its first tribal CM, Amarsinh Chaudharv.

Castes candidates, the BJP won 11. In the Vadodara city seat, the BJP's sitting legislator Manish Vakil won with 1,30,112 votes, while Congress candidate Gunavantrav Parmar got only 31,907 votes. BJP's Ishwarbhai Parmar, the sitting MLA from Bardoli, won with 1,18,140 votes over Congress's Pannaben Patel's 28,478 votes. These are overwhelming majorities, to say the least.

Region-wise, the BJP's performance was no different. It won more than two-thirds of

the available seats from every region. It won 46 of the 54 Saurashtra and Kutch seats, 22 of the 32 seats in North Gujarat, 55 of 61 Central Guiarat seats, and 33 of the 35 seats in south Guiarat. This was a truly pan-Gujarat man-Most significantly, 17 of

the 19 segments which have a significant Muslim presence and are considered "Muslimdominated" by pollsters went for the BJP. For instance, the BJP's Sangitaben Rajendra Patil emerged victorious from



Limbayat with over 52 per cent of the vote share to substantially disprove the myth that Muslims are not with the BJP. The usual observation by opposition parties, especially Congress, on such results is that AIMIM has split the

minority vote. This time even that fig leaf was denied to them, as the AIMIM did not get a substantial vote share. In all the seats it contested, the AIMIM got fewer votes than the victory margin of the BJP candidates. The BJP continued its dom-

inance in urban areas by winning 63 per cent of votes as against 58 per cent in the 2017 elections. The party received 48 per cent votes in rural assembly seats as against the Congress' 30 per cent. While the BJP increased its vote share in both urban and rural seats, the biggest seat gains, as compared to the 2017 elections, came from the rural and rurban (semi-urban) areas. This notable trend of increasing support from rural voters could be seen in the recent Munugode by-election too.

The people of Gujarat witnessed how the BJP government built the State meticulously on all fronts and appreciated it in the form of votes. The world's largest canal Narmada canal - which brought water for the draught-prone and waterscarce Gujarat, the relocation of the Tata Nano project, which highlighted the Ease of Doing Business for investors, the recent selection of Gujarat by Vedanta for its Semiconductor and Displays manufacturing venture, the Gift City which has the potential to make Gujarat a global financial services hub, symbolise the all-round development in agriculture,

Himachal Pradesh's result also deserves a mention here.

He affirmed that legal action will be taken if any company does not provide the required information and any organization should give records wherever it does business. He revealed that Chit companies are collecting deposits in the name of security, improper payment of interest, and non-maintenance of separate balance sheets were identified in the inspections.

He said that all the companies are giving the requested information except the Margadarshi hence a special audit will be conducted on the Margadarshi. He said that auditors and forensic experts will go to Margadarshi's headquarters and conduct inspections. He stated that the officials have asked for the details to know the financial status of the Margadarsi company but still the company did not provide any information. He questioned how reasonable it was for Margadarshi company to give the details in Telangana or Karnataka while doing busi-

ness in Andhra Pradesh. Ramakrishna said that the responsibility of providing the information is on Margadarsi and it should cooperate in this matter and the officials will initiate action according to the law if the company fails to provide the required information.

Robotic technology needed in farming: MVS Nagi Reddy

He recalled that in 2019 a record 80.13 lakh metric tonnes of paddy was produced and said that it would be broken during the current season. He said that the government is ready to procure 40 to 45 lakh tonnes of paddy and the farmers should be ready. He asked the officials to resolve the issues with patience and

ing the last three years 1.5 lakh farmers were igiven Rs 425 crore under the Rythu Bharosa scheme besides Rs 120 crore under crop insurance and Rs 28 crore under crop loan with zero interest. A total of Rs 700 crore benefit was done to the farmers in the district during the last three years, the Collector said.

Naidu promises to restore all schemes

Telugu Desam Party (TDP) chief Nara Chandrababu Naidu has said that he will take the responsibility for protecting reservations for Muslims by fighting on behalf of Minorities and will restore all welfare schemes after coming to power. The TDP chief interacted with Muslim Minorities at Ponnur on Friday as part of the

'Badude Badudu' programme.

Naidu said that when the TDP came to power in 1983, within two years, in 1985 itself, Minorities Corporation was formed, Urdu was recognised as a second official language, Haj House was set up in Hyderabad, and Urdu University was established in Hyderabad and after the State bifurcation, another Urdu University was set up in Kurnool.

Naidu further claimed that TDP provided 'Ramzan Tofa' for over 10 lakh Muslims and even 'Sankranthi Kanuka' was extended to them. He alleged that the other schemes started by TDP for the welfare of Muslims were cancelled by the Jagan Mohan Reddy



government. Naidu questioned why Chief Minister Jagan Mohan Reddy could not continue the 'Pelli Kanuka' scheme though he had promised Rs 10 lakh under the scheme. He stated that there is no need for the basic qualification of SSC either to become a Minister in his Cabinet or to become an Advisor to the Government but to be eligible for the 'Pelli Kanuka' scheme the beneficiary should have a basic qualification of SSC. Chandrababu

promised to revive all the schemes

for Muslim Minorities once the TD is back in power.

Naidu called upon the Muslim community to react to false cases registered against anyone. Tomorrow you may have to face the same situation if you do not react now," he observed.

Chandrababu Naidu expressed serious concern that the wakf lands are being illegally occupied and promised to save the wakf properties once the TDP is back in power and the pensions too will be paid on time.

Survivors, victims facing stigma: VIMUKTHI

stigma.

M Apoorva, president of VIMUKTHI, said that they were facing huge challenges and living pathetic lives, without a helping hand that con-

soled them and shared their problems. VIMUKTHI conducted a meeting here on Friday on the occasion of International Human Rights Day. "People don't even realise that we, too, are human beings and are entitled to enjoy our rights," Apoorva said.

HELP, with the support of Sanjog, conducted a survey recently, which found that 88 per cent of the survivors and sex workers were facing social stigma. Sadly, the major sources of stigma were immediate family members (parents and partners

No end to CBI investigation into YS Vivekananda's murder!

Political circles are bristling with criticism that the probe into Vivekananda Reddy's murder, which had taken place ahead of Assembly elections, is still being prolonged unduly.

Did the CBI, which took over the investigation into the case, take into consideration the contradictory statements issued by Vivekananda Reddy's daughter Sunitha? Did CBI take into consideration the investigation report submitted by the Special Investigation Team (SIT) constituted by the then Telugu Desam party government, to probe the mur-

Did the interrogation of hundreds of witnesses by SIT and nacro test conducted in leading laboratories prove futile?

Suspicions are raised as to why the CBI has not chosen to respond to some media reports on the issue. Will the CBI conclude the probe into the case soon or not? Whether a strategy of keeping the case alive till the next elections is being fine-tuned to pose problems to the ruling YSRCP? Does CBI want to ensure that the bail given to the three accused is cancelled?

The apex court's directions in the case of the bail for one of the accused, Yerra Gangireddy kicked off a fresh debate on the case among the political cir-

According to the political grapevine, the investigation into the murder case is likely to continue for some more time going by the latest developments

Those in the know of the things expressed over the way the investigation is being conducted by the premier investigation agency, CBI, as it is not able to conclude the investigation into the case even two and half years after it took over the probe. Politicians and former IPS officials expressed sur-

prise over the probe dragging on.

Those, who used to hail the CBI to skies, are also disappointed over the undue delay in completing the task and ensuring that the trial begins.

Political circles have been questioning why the CBI chose to ignore the narco analysis, polygraph and brain mapping tests conducted on the accused. Questioning them again is nothing but an exercise to buy time, according to critics. Former IPS officials alleged that the way the investigation is being conducted raising more doubts.

CBI to conclude its probe into the case early. The CBI investigation seems different from the one conducted by the SIT.

but the angle of the investigation by the CBI begged to differ, sayMainly, the CBI did not take contradictory statements issued by Sunita initial-

There were no disputes in the joint family that has over 700 members. Moreover, she went on record by saying that her father worked hard to make Y S Jaganmohan Reddy the Chief Minister of AP. Former IPS officials were perplexed over the CBI ignoring these statements made by Sunita. Sunita demanded that the police question the then TDP Minister Adinarayana Reddy, but later she did not insist on it.

Former IPS officials expressed their surprise over the CBI ignoring the SIT report, which mentioned about the second marriage of Vivekananda Reddy and property disputes.

Surprise is being expressed over the CBI line of investigation not touching these aspects at all. Vivekananda Reddy who is firm on giving due share to his second wife and a respectable place for the second wife in the family triggered disputes, according to deposition before the SIT.


Vivekananda Reddy's family members stripped him of his cheque power out of the foresight that he may give a share to his second wife. As a result, Vivekaknand Reddy faced many financial troubles, the SIT reported in its report.

Sunita went on record on August 8, 2021, stating that her father was done to death. But she is being questioned why she did not complain about it to the police the same day.

To a question on how did she get Vivekanand

Reddy's murder photos and letters on July 28, 2020, and August 8, 2021, Sunita made contradictory statements? The CBI considering such irrational statements is being criticised.

She went on record saying that her husband showed her father's photos on his mobile phone.



Soon, she contradicted her own statement saying that it was wrong. The CBI, probing the case depending on Sunita's statements, was a butt of criticism. The political circles say that the CBI ignored this vital line of investigation. In fact, the truth behind the murder case can be unearthed by probing the case in this direction. Ignoring the family disputes in the probe is being criticized.

Surprise is being expressed over the CBI framing new rules in probing the case. The CBI filed a case against Viveka's PA Krishna Reddy who complained about the murder to the police. The CBI s accused of creating a new style of investigating the case. A suspect in the murder case, Prameshwar Reddy, was admitted to a hospital on March 13, 2019, for treatment of chest pain. But, he slipped out of the hospital secretly and met TDP MLC BTech Ravi who stayed in Harita Hotel in Kadapa. The hospital video camera recorded he was speaking on phone to someone at 3 am on March 14. So far, the CBI did not probe into it to the chagrin of

Personal Assistant Krishna Reddy did not hand over Viveka's mobile phone and the letter written by him before he was murdered. Only after the arrival of Sunita and her husband in Pulivendula, the PA handed the mobile phone and the letter to the couple. The CBI also did not probe into this, kicking off several doubts in the minds of the people. The CBI apparently did not question Sunita and her husband for having deleted messages from the mobile phone and why did the letter and mobile phone were not handed over to the police. The critics felt it very strange.

Watchman Ranganna, who initially pleaded ignorance about who had committed the murder, after a gap of two years to the surprise of one and all, told the CBI while deposing before it that he was an eye-witness to the murder. The CBI did not question him about what stopped him from going out and told it to one and all.

Interrogating Ranganna on scientific lines, the SIT subjected him to a polygraph test on August 1 and 13 at the Central Forensic Laboratory in Gujarat and again subjected him on August 3 and 5 to a

brain mapping test and Narco analysis test. When questioned him whether he was threatened, he replied to the SIT in the negative.Brain mapping tests and Narco analysis test and polygraph tests play a crucial role in the investigation of crime. Any investigating agency will take them as a yardstick. While subjecting him to these tests, Ranganna denied any threats. But, while deposing before the CBI he answered the questions as desired by the CBI, fuelling doubts in people's minds.MP Avinash Reddy mounted pressure on Viveka's PA Krishna Reddy to give false evidence on the involvement of Bhaskar Reddy in the case, which

led to a volley of criticism in the case. The CBI did not question suspect Y G Rajeshwar Reddy about his role in the case, fuelling many suspicions in the case. He spoke to Viveka's driver and also went up to his house of Viveka. He spoke to Sunil Yadav on the night of the murder, according

to to call data, but the CBI did not investigate this. The CBI used approver Dastagiri according to its whims and fancies and obtained statements and registered cases against him. The criticism tarnished the image of an investigating agency like the CBI.In the statements issued by Dastagiri on August 25 and

Sivasankar Reddy and Yerra Gangireddy. The political circles allege that the CBI was trying to rame people in the case who have nothing to do with the incident.

Going by how the CBI mounted pressure on DSP Vasudevan and CI Sankaraiah to obtain statements from them as it desired, all the 161 statements recorded by the CBI as fabricated, according to criticism. The CBI failed to prove its version over Rs 40-crore deal struck to eliminate Viveka. The CBI failed to prove that at least Rs 4 crore has changed hands during the two and half years of its investigation.Dastagiri told the CBI that he distributed Rs 1 crore given to him among many persons, but the CBI failed to prove that Sunil Yadav or any other person distributed money to the suspects, it is regarded as another failure on the part of the CBI.The CBI documented money saved by Munna by selling his property as a 'supari' amount. The CBI failed to mention in the charge-sheet crucial aspects like when did Munna deposit the money in his locker, and how many times did he operate the locker. It allegedly establishes the lack of seriousness on the part of the CBI in probing the case, according to criticism from the political grapevine.

Registering the case against Yerra Gangireddy is being viewed with suspicion right from the beginning, according to criticism. Internal protocol data records establish the fact that Gangireddy was very much at his house on the fateful night when Viveka was murdered. Similarly, another accused Umasankar Reddy was also at his home on the fateful night. Surprisingly, the CBI maintains that the duo was at the residence of Viveka on the night of

the murder. The CBI is rejecting the investigation carried out by the SIT along scientific lines, indicating a major conspiracy behind this. The CBI is probing the case even putting the snails to shame. Whose interests is it trying to protect? Which party the CBI is trying to protect? Is it trying to harass any party at all? These questions are on the lips of every political leader. The political circles see CBI's plan to harass the ruling YSRCP by stretching the probe till the elections. Former IPs officials say that the CBI's

line of investigation is harmful to its image. The political circles appeal to the CBI to make introspection as its style of functioning targeted to send back those who are out on the bail in the case.

Govt seeks House nod for additional spending of Rs 3.25 L cr this fiscal

PNS NEW DELHI

The Government on Friday sought Parliament nod for net additional spending of over Rs 3.25 lakh crore in the current fiscal, which includes over Rs 1.09 lakh crore towards fertiliser subsidy payout.

This additional spending is over and above the proposed amount in Budget 2022-23. As per the Budget, the government estimated a total expenditure of Rs 39.45 lakh crore for 2022-23, as compared to Rs 37.70 lakh crore for the previous fiscal. Besides, approval for Rs 80,348.25 crore has been sought for meeting expenditure of the food and consumer affairs ministry mainly towards giving free foodgrains to the poor.

Approval has also been sought for expenditure of the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas towards payments of LPG subsidies to oil marketing companies and LPG connections to the poor under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana, among others totalling to Rs 29,944 crore.

As per the first batch of supplementary demands for grants tabled in Lok Sabha by Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary, approval is being sought for gross additional expenditure of about Rs 4.36 lakh crore.

Of this, proposals involving net cash outgo aggregates to over Rs 3.25 lakh crore and gross additional expenditure, matched by savings of ministries/departments or by enhanced receipts,



aggregates to over Rs 1.10 lakh

The first batch of Supplementary Demands for Grants for 2022-23 includes 75 Grants and 6 Appropriations.

The additional expenditure also includes Rs 13,669 crore and

46,000 crore additional expenditure by the Rural Development Ministry, which includes Rs 4,920 crore for Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee scheme (MGNRE-In addition, the government's

capital expenditure (capex) has been enhanced by about Rs 31,000 crore for the current financial year.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman had raised capex by 35.4 per cent for the financial year 2022-23 to Rs 7.5 lakh crore, from Rs 5.5 lakh crore in the previous year. For meeting additional expenditure under capital outlay on Indian Railways (commercial lines), the supplementary demands for grants has proposed Rs 12,000 crore.

Shortage of 1.35 lakh personnel in three services: Centre

The three services are reeling under a shortage of 1.35 lakh personnel with the maximum number of vacancies of 1.18 lakh in the Army, according to details provided by the government in Lok Sabha on Friday.

The total shortage in the Indian Navy (sailors) was estimated at 11,587 till September 30, Minister of State for Defence Ajay Bhatt said in reply to a question.

He said the number of

vacant posts in the Indian Air Force (Airmen and Non-Combatant) as on November 1, 2022, was 5,819.

The number in the Army was till July 1 and it included junior commissioned officers and other ranks.

"A total of 40000 vacancies have been advertised for

JCOs/OR in the Indian Army. A total of 3,000 vacancies have been advertised for Agniveers in the year 2022 in the Indian Navy. 3,000 vacancies have been advertised in the Indian Air Force as Agniveer-vayu in the year 2022," Bhatt said.

He said all the recruitments at the level of jawans are being done under the Agnipath scheme. Noting that on average, 60,000 vacancies occur in all three services every year, out of which approximately

50,000 vacancies are for the Army, the minister said due to the suspension of recruitment rallies in the last two years because of the COVID-19 situation, there was a shortfall of 1,08,685 jawans in the Indian Army at present.

With the improvement in the COVID-19 situation and the start of the recruitment, these vacancies are expected to come down in coming years, he added. To a separate question, he said approximately 45,906 acres of defence land under the management of different services and organisations of the defence ministry is presently lying vacant.

In response to another question, Bhatt said the government has undertaken the modernisation of the defence airfield infrastructure in two

Collegium's tentative decision cannot be brought in public domain: SC

The Supreme Court on Friday dismissed a plea seeking disclosure of the details of a collegium meeting held on December 12, 2018 under the Right to Information Act, underlining a "tentative decision" of the multi-member body cannot be brought in the public domain.

A bench of Justices MR Shah and CT Ravikumar said lutions drawn signed by all collegium members can be said to be a final decision. Tentative resolutions drawn upon discussion and consultation among the members cannot be said to be final unless they are signed by all of them, it said.

"Collegium is a multi-member body whose tentative decision cannot be brought in the public domain," it noted.

Amit Shah to meet Maha, K'taka CMs on Dec 14 over border row

Union Home Minister Amit Shah will meet the chief ministers of Maharashtra and Karnataka here on December 14 to soothe tempers on the border dispute between the two states, NCP leader Amol Kolhe said here on Friday.

Kolhe was speaking to reporters after a delegation of parliamentarians of the Maharashtra Vikas Aghadi (MVA) -- Shiv Sena-NCP-Congress coalition -- met Shah to air their grievances on the

border dispute. complained to Shah about the 'insulting references" to Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj by Maharashtra Governor Bhagat Singh Koshiyari and some other BJP leaders. "The home minister gave us a patient hearing and assured the MVA parliamentarians that he will call chief ministers of Maharashtra and Karnataka on December 14 and work towards finding a cordial solution to the issue," Kolhe, the



reporters here. On Thursday, the MVA par-

liamentarians had written to Shah warning that the Karnataka-Maharashtra border row had reached a stage where it could erupt into fullblown violence and his personal intervention. In a letter to Shah, they claimed that "high-handed" actions by Karnataka had "hurt the sentiments" of the Marathi-speaking people in the border districts at a time the matter was in the Supreme Court. Kolhe said the MVA delegation also sought strict action against those leaders and constitutional authorities who had made "insulting references" to Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj.

Bhupendra Patel quits as Gujarat CM, set for another term

Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel tendered his resignation along with his entire cabinet on Friday to pave the way for formation of a new government in the state after the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) landslide victory in the Assembly elections. The BJP registered a historic victory in Gujarat by clinching 156 seats in the 182-member House.

Patel, accompanied by Gujarat BJP chief CR Paatil and



party's chief whip Pankaj Desai, handed over his resignation to Governor Acharya Devvrat at the Raj Bhavan in Gandhinagar. This is just a formality as the party has already announced that Patel will be the next chief

minister of the state ahead of the polls. On Thursday, the state BJP chief had once again announced the Patel would continue to occupy the top post in the state and his swearing-in ceremony would be held on December 12.

"The governor had accepted the resignation of the chief minister and his cabinet. Till the formation of the new government, Patel will remain as the caretaker chief minister," Desai told reporters outside Raj

lockdowns Sharing a news report on the court hearing on Twitter, Gehlot said, "We welcome this comment of the Supreme Court. It has been our constant demand from the Centre that the scope of the National Food Security Act be expanded on the basis of the current population. It is the responsibility of every government to provide food to all citizens." The Rajasthan government pro-

vided food to all during the pandemic with the resolve that "no one should sleep hungry", he said. "Even today there are about 900 Indira Rasoi operating in the state where a full meal is available for Rs 8 in which the state government gives a subsidy of Rs 17 per plate," the chief minister

The government notified the NFSA on September 10, 2013 with the objective of providing food and nutritional security by ensuring access to adequate quantity of quality food at affordable prices to people to live a life with dignity. The Act provides for coverage of up to 75 per cent of the rural population and 50 per cent of the urban population for receiving subsidised foodgrains under the Targeted Public Distribution System

SOLUTION TO CANCER CRISIS IN INDIA Indian-American doctor offers 'Panchamrit'

PNS WASHINGTON

An eminent Indian-American doctor has offered a five-point solution, which he calls Panchamrit, to address the cancer crisis in India.

Prominent among them include declaring cancer a notifiable disease, subsidising cancer screening, and establishing a command-and-control

"We should get accurate cancer incidence and prevalence data, like in the US. Cancer should be considered a notifi-

able disease. This will help to identify high-density areas and how to allot resources," Dr Dattatreyudu Nori told PTI in an interview. Recipient of the 2015 Padma

Shri awardee for his contributions to the field of medicine, Dr Nori noted that since the establishment of the National Cancer Institute of India in 2018, significant progress has been made. But this is not enough, he asserted.

Compared to the US, we have a late start in creating NCI hence the important pro-



grammes have to be put on a fast track and accelerated path. Worried about the status of cancer disease in India, Dr Nori said he has shared his solution mechanism to deci-

sion-makers in India. Observing that the Central Government and most of the State governments have subsidised cancer care for cancer treatment, he said that these programmes should also include subsidised cancer screening. This will incentivise people to go for free cancer screenings.

Recommending the establishment of a cancer command and control (CCC) centre in India, Dr Nori said that this should be the apex body of all the issues related to the fight against cancer in India. The cancer command and control

centre should collect five-year data from the Medicare database from each state and central programme and develop cancer geographical distribu-

"Using this data, a CANCER ATLAS should be developed which should show cancer info for every district, State. This should update every five years. This should be a major source of information for all central, state and local authorities to develop their programmes and prioritise their resources," Dr Nori said.



Bad beginning

The Veep should have better avoided criticism of the apex court in his Rajya Sabha speech

Sabha with a combative note. In his maiden address in the Upper House, he expressed his displeasure over the fact that the National Judicial Appointments Commission (NJAC) Bill, unanimously passed by Parliament, was "undone by the Supreme Court." This was, according to him, a "severe compromise of parliamentary sovereignty and disregard of the mandate of the people." The remark was as uncharacteristic as it was avoidable. Uncharacteristic because when a person enters a high office, they prefer to say nice things and sound accommodative. Platitudes rather than barbed comments are heard on the first day. But it looks like Dhankhar is yet to shed his belligerence that he exhibited in Kolkata as West Bengal Governor. He became a thorn in Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's side, incessantly slating her



government and its actions. It is widely believed that he has been rewarded for his bellicosity. At any rate, his elevation may have inspired other Governors to become more aggressive; one example is Kerala Governor Arif Mohammad Khan. But Dhankhar must realise that his statements will now be highlighted and scrutinised much more than they were earlier. He should have avoided criticism of the apex court in such strong words. He must remember that the executive, the legislature, and the judiciary are three integral organs of the system which have to work in tandem, not fight with each other.

This is not to say that the Supreme Court's decisions cannot or should not be criticised; they can

be and must be, for that is how a vibrant democracy functions. But the manner in which criticism is made is very important—more so when the person slamming an apex court verdict holds a Constitutional office, as Dhankhar does. Hinting that the top court of the land disregarded the mandate of the people was not just excessive but also in bad taste. We commented earlier that the Government's preference for the NJAC was justified. Three or half of the now disbanded NJAC comprised top judges only; two other members were also appointed in a manner in which government representation was in a minority. It looked like a reasonable system but the Supreme Court invalidated it in 2015. So, the collegium system continues. A few weeks ago, Law and Justice Minister Kiren Rijiju described the collegium system as "opaque." In fact, he claimed that a majority of judges agreed with him: "Judges are not happy with the collegium system today." He claimed that when judges select judges, there is politics. In fact, "the politics of us politicians is nothing to what goes on in the judiciary." By echoing the Government's position on an important issue, Dhankhar has not presented himself as an impartial Chairman of the Rajya Sabha who could hope to enjoy bipartisan support in the House. This is unfortunate.

The ayurveda circle

Among ancient India's biggest gifts to the world,

we must embrace it emphatically first

I nion Minister of State for Tourism Shripad Naik has rightly advocated the need for giving benefits of 'Ayurveda' to the world. The 9th World Ayurveda Congress is being organised by the World Avurveda Foundation with support of the Union Ministry of AYUSH and Government of Goa. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will address the valedictory session on December 11. "It (Ayurveda) is not just medicine, it's our tradition. We need to give benefits of it to the world," he said. "Ayurveda has been facilitated by the setting up of a separate Ministry of AYUSH, credit of which goes to Modi" Naik added. He also said that the Modi government took Yoga to the world. And that is perhaps where he was off the mark. Indeed the AYUSH ministry was formed to give fillip to the alternative medicines especially Ayurveda but has it achieved its objective is rather questionable. More than 5,000 delegates and 200 delegates from

> 30 countries are attending the congress. Though conclaves like this do help, the minister and the government at large should understand that it takes more than just words to make a system popular. Equating it to Yoga would be wrong as Yoga was already popular in the west and the credit for that certainly does not go to the government.

The Ministry of AYUSH, is responsible for developing education, research and propagation of traditional medicine systems in India. The Department of Indian Systems of Medicine and Homeopathy (ISM&H) was made into a ministry by the Modi Government in 2014. But in its eight years there is hardly anything that AYUSH can be proud of. It start-

ed with much fanfare but has delivered nothing. It promised 100 AYUSH hospitals across the country were proposed, an Institute of Naturopathy in Pune at the cost of Rs 1,000 crore and posting 4,000 AYUSH practitioners across the country. Perhaps the AYUSH ministry can throw some light on the progress made. Somewhere the ministry lost its sense of direction and got embroiled in unnecessary controversies with its advisories which were not backed by scientific research. It failed to provide an infrastructure for alternative medicine and create awareness about the alternative medicines. The minister would do well to come up with a viable plan to provide facilities for the alternative medicines. Before that happens it would be just lip service to a great cause by the union ministers, nothing more.

Common 'enemy No 1' is China



Our Asian neighbour, riding on the might of its economic muscle, doesn't mind being brazenly expansionist even at the cost of global peace

eorge Fernandes was perhaps the first Indian politician to call out the Chinese as 'enemy number one'. It had raised hackles, piqued debate and seen as a tad bit alarmist and premature, as the hyphenated relation with Pakistan was still consuming emotions. However, it didn't take long for the neologism of Zhongguo shiji or Chinese Century, to confirm George Fernandes's forewarning. The advent of Xi Jinping as the President of China in 2013 accelerated the portents of an expansionist and authoritarian Dragon that would threaten the peace of established global order. Back in the United States,

the erstwhile Soviet Union was

the centrepiece of its military strategy till its implosion with the Revolutions of 1989. A brief run of the US as the solo hegemonic power in the 90s ensued. However, it was the George Bush administration which recognised the emerging realities with the Pacific Ocean emerging as the theatre of tensions and focus of deployment in Cold War 1.0.2, with China having supplanted the Soviet Union/Russia, as the primary enemy. Given the physical distance between the mainland of US and China, constraints of a viable and sustainable 'long-range power projection' became inevitable, and therefore the urgency for establishing credible and strategic partnerships in the Indo-Pacific realm. This doctrinal evolution was the progenitor to the strategic conceptualisation of Sinocentric 'blocs' like QUAD (Quadrilateral – Japan, India, Australia and US) and AUKUS (Australia, UK and US), as indeed the 'Pivot to Asia' policy by the subsequent Obama Administration, Barack Obama was believed to have been sworn into the Oval Office as the 'first Pacific President'. But it was Donald Trump who trans-China narrative into open hostility - Trump as, 'the most consequential spoke of Chinese expansionism in the geopolitical and geo-economic realm that needed to be a free and open internationchecked, bluntly. From person- al system'. It went on to add



ening Chinese allies like Pakistan and North Korea to even calling the Covid-19 virus as 'Chinese Virus', Trump opened the floodgates to China.

administration has stayed the course on China and Biden himself described his conversation with Xi Jinping on the sidelines of the Group 20 summit at Bali as, 'very blunt with one another. Even though it is the traditional cold war nemesis i.e., Russia, which is in a bloody conflict with the US-supported Ukraine, and is doing so in the midst of the earlier imagined theatre of Eastern Europe – US remains firm in holding the strategic view that it is China and not Russia (hence, Indo-Pacific theatre and not the European or the Middle Eastern region) that is going to be the 'enemy number one, going forward. Even the recently released 2022 China Military Power Report by the US Defense Department confirms China and systemic challenge to the US national security and

FIRST COLUMN DIGITAL NOMADISM: AN INSPIRATIONAL TREND

Organisations should enter into agreements with nomads

Businesses have witnessed unprecedented trends during Covid times. One area that has seen a major revamp is the place of work for employees. The pandemic gave wings to an already fledgling idea of digital nomadism and changed employees' workstations forever.

Apart from the office, a digital nomad can work remotely from any place like a beach, a library or even a foreign country while traveling. According to a survey conducted by MBO Partners, this trend is fast rising. In the US alone, the number of digital nomads increased by 50 per cent to 11 million in 2020 and is expected to grow to a massive 35.7 million by 2025. It is interesting to note that the composition of this group changed from freelancers, independent consultants and entrepreneurs to regular, traditional, office goers with 9-5 work hours.

But who are these digital nomads? A research by Harvard Business Review finds that an average digital nomad is a digitally savvy, well-educated and highly skilled individual employed in tech industry, the creative arena, digital marketing and so on. Although digital nomadism became popular during the pandemic, this trend does not show any signs of slowing down. There are some ways in which employers can cater to this demand for flexible remote working facilities.



Firstly, the flexible policies that can provide freedom to employees can help companies attract talent. Many companies like Airbnb, 3M and Lift have taken cue and have developed and implemented adaptable remote working policies. The second most important requirement to promote digital nomadism is strong technological investments. To allow employees data access, many companies are using cloud-based technologies.

Thirdly, it is easier for companies with open office design concepts to step ahead and transform into a culture of digital nomadism. Although it is difficult for traditional companies with fixed 9-5 working hours and hierarchical seating arrangements to take a leap into remote working, companies which already open work spaces with different and new design elements like lounges, game rooms, project rooms and hotdesks, can help transition from flexible work style to nomadic work style.

So are companies in general ready with their policies to attract digital nomads? It is found that in spite of the growing trend of digital nomadism, only few organisations have formally designed policies for them. Therefore, digital nomads generally travel without their organisations knowing about it. In most cases, the immediate supervisor would have this information, but due to lack of concrete organisational policies would just turn a blind eye. However, this lack of clear policies can leave a firm open to any litigation or regulatory risks.

Generally, a person working in a particular location comes under the jurisdiction of that state/country, and the laws and regulations of the country apply to her irrespective of the location of the employer. So being present in another state or country, there is a possibility that digital nomads unintentionally end up creating the presence of the employer as a permanent establishment exposing it to an array of legal, regulatory, taxation laws and rules. Organisations should realise that the trend of digital nomadism is here to stay. To attract and retain employees, organisations should enter into agreements with digital nomads to clearly specify the terms and conditions of remote working.

Social media is playing an important role in the rise of digital nomadism. Owing to their strong social media presence, digital nomads communicate about their experiences through vlogs, blogs and Instagram accounts, making their lifestyle coveted. Although digital nomadism started out as a choice, it is more of an aspiration now. Organisations must adapt quickly and include the requirements of employ-

ees who want to enjoy being free to travel. (The author is an associate professor at Amity University)

And as the British were most brutal to the freedom fighters from the Hindu-right, some of its leaders had to buckle to survive, for you can't fight war unless you are alive. Therefore, maligning them by selectively highlighting certain of their deeds out of EXTRAORDINARILY 1980 for his birth centenary, she context is both unfair and ungersteful context is both unfair and ungrateful.

In any case, what is it that we gain by vilifying those who fought for our freedom? Inexplicably, Vinayak Damodar Savarkar is the most prominent Hindu-right freedom fighter who remains the prime target of left-liberals. He was an atheist, a prolific writer, an ideologue, a powerful orator, and a firebrand revolutionary leader. He wrote 'The Indian War of Independence-1857' for its 50th anniversary and 'The Essentials of Hindutva' among many others. The British banned the former book even before it was published

For waging war against the colonial government, the British sentenced him to 50 years of imprisonment and transportation for life. He was lodged in the infamous Cellular Jail in the Andamans. The punishment there was inhuman. It ranged from hard labour to extra hours on the grinding mill, to standing handcuffed for a week, to bar-fetters for six months, to confinement in solitary cells, to four days of starvation diet and to cross bars for 10 days, a punishment which compelled the victim to keep his legs apart.

Savarkar endured all that inhuman torture for 11 long years, which others could not even imagine to be for 11 min-



utes. With the waning of Communism in post 1980s, many leftists sneaked into Congress pastures, bringing their visceral hatred for anything Hindu, including Savarkar, and toxified minds of Congress leadership, including Rahul Gandhi. Their hidden agenda is to transform the Congress into a new Communist party.

For several decades the RSS-BJP used to loathe Gandhi, Nehru, and

several Congress leaders of freedom struggle, but it did not give them any political dividends. As they needed to deepen their political acceptability, they course-corrected and started appropriating leaders from other ideological streams. They built the world's tallest statue of Sardar Patel. They incorporated Gandhi and Ambedkar in their pantheon. They eulogise Indira Gandhi

as Maa Durga. They fete PV Narsimha Rao to gain cross political legitimacy for their own brand of reforms. They installed a statue of Bose under the India Gate canopy. After appropriating Swami Vivekananda, Tagore, Jaya Prakash Narayan, they are now even celebrating anti-Hindu Periyar and Jyotiba Phule. Sooner than later, they will also appropriate Nehru. The list is getting longer despite feeble protests of the Congress against BJP stealing

The results of the general elections, from 1951 to 2019, show that a party (not a coalition) could secure absolute majority only when Hindus consolidate for it. From 1951 to 1971, Hindus were solidly with the Congress for its inclusivity. Emergency distanced them but marginally. The dismal failure of the Janata Party experiment brought them back to the Congress in 1980. The last time Congress secured absolute majority was in 1984 as Hindus hugely consolidated in the wake of tragic assassination of prime minister Indira Gandhi.

Thereafter, it secured a near majority in 1991 due to Hindu consolidation in the phases of election

that took place after the terrible assassination of Rajiv Gandhi. The UPA rule from 2004 to 2014 badly alienated Hindus from the Congress as it was widely seen for the first time as anti-Hindu. As a result, Hindus massively rallied behind the BJP as never before, giving it absolute majority for the first time in its history in 2014 and repeated it in 2019. More importantly, the election data indicate that historically Hindus reposed faith in the Congress more than in any other party when it was centrist and not anti-Hindu.

Here is a lesson for the Congress. Prakash Karat is a top apparatchik of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) and was its national chief from 2005 to 2015. As opposed to the pragmatism of his predecessor Harkishen Singh Surjeet, Prakash Karat is extraordinarily rigid in ideology and virulently anti-Hindu and had no personal skin in the electoral game. No wonder, during his era the CPI(M) had the sharpest downfall from which it could

To recap, while on the one hand, Congress is losing its icons to the RSS-BJP, on the other its diatribe for no rhyme or reason against Hinduright and historical personalities like Savarkar is pushing Hindus away from it. Why is the Congress in selfdestructive mode?

Because the Congress leadership is in the intellectual grip of leftliberals, who have no skin in the electoral game. They are doing to the Congress what Prakash Karat did to the CPI(M).

Highlight of COP27 was 'Loss and Damage Fund'

Increasing climate risk around the globe requires a more strategic and broader approach to incorporate optimisation of consumption

he 27th edition of the United Nations Climate Change Conference or Conference of the Parties, COP27, concluded recently at Sharm El-Sheikh and made positive but limited progress. The Egyptian COP27 Presidency has defined the

summit's four key goals. With mitigation, all parties, especially those in a position to "lead by example", are urged to take "bold and immediate actions" and to reduce emissions to limit global warming well below 2°C. With adaptation, parties have to ensure that COP27 makes the "crucially needed progress" towards enhancing climate change resilience and assisting the world's most

vulnerable communities. The goal of finance called

for making significant progress on climate finance, including the delivery of the promised \$100 billion per year to assist developing countries. With collaboration, the UN negotiations stuck to the consensusbased approach, as reaching an agreement will require "inclusive and active participation from all stakeholders".

Increasing climate risk requires a more strategic and broader approach to incorporate optimisation of consumption. Doing more with less, adopting circular economy principles and removing incentives for inefficient equipment, business models and lifestyles need to be at the forefront and centre of the

conversation. Inspiration needs to be

Mahatma Gandhi that "the world has enough for everyone's needs, but not everyone's greed". This applies not only to energy, but also conserving water, building materials, transportation, food and textiles. Definitive progress was made on the long-standing carbon market process, but many operational decisions were postponed for future negotiations.

Further, the negotiations remained confined to a relatively narrow agenda on fossil fuels and therefore missed the opportunity to comprehensively address all sources While COP26 focused

on mitigation, the highlight of COP27 was creation of the 'Loss and Damage Fund' to drawn from the words of support most vulnerable access to reliable energy and

countries impacted severely climate disasters. Countries in Asia (India, Bangladesh, Vietnam, and Philippines), Africa (Kenya, Malawi, Chad, Niger), Pacific Islands (Fiji, Tuvalu, Kiribati) and Caribbean Islands (Haiti) are amongst the most vulnerable and impacted.

An area of particular attention is the inadequacy of current climate financing models. Global climate finance remains below the third of annual requirements. At COP27, negotiators deliberated on setting a 'new collective quantified goal on climate finance' in 2024, taking into account the needs and priorities of developing countries.

With millions of people in developing nations lacking

their energy requirements adds to the carbon emission.

Energy access will power the socio-economic aspirations of 2.8 billion people without electricity. For an equitable and inclusive green transition, a scaled-up and integrated approach is required to support the clean energy transition to distributed renewable energy and grid-based renewables and will reduce dependence on fossil fuels.

Distributed renewable energy is relevant even for cities since they consume 60-80 per cent of energy and generate 70-75 per cent of GHG emissions. Hence, enabling energy transition will require significant effort in reforming urban planning and infra-

depending on fossil fuels for structure delivery. Technology convergence across electricity, telecom, and transport present newer opportunities for reducing carbon footprints, improving quality of life, reducing cost, and enhancing long-term sustainability. Underground utility systems, which are gaining global popularity, can be integrated with the master plans. Such an approach will require new regulations and institutional structuring to include energy as a part of urban planning. Thus, a strategic approach to urbanization presents a large opportunity, given a strong positive correation between per capita income and urbanisation.

> Last year, the Conference of Parties 26 (COP26) in Glasgow reiterated the global community's ongoing response

to the Paris Agreement to tackle the climate crisis while declaring a state of global emergency. The goal to achieve net-zero global emissions by 2050 while keeping the increase in global average temperature below 1.5 degrees Celsius in comparison to preindustrial levels was wellintentioned.

COP 27 balanced that with progress on adaptation and the creation of a loss and damage fund. Barbados Climate Envoy called the fund "a small victory for humankind". However, the overall ambition and, more importantly, action on all fronts need to be significantly and urgently scaled to achieve more significant victories in mitigating the global

Sebi clarifies on 'schemes of arrangement' for entities

apital markets regulator Sebi on Friday clarified on the framework pertaining to schemes of arrangement' for entities that have only listed their debt securities. Scheme of arrangement is a court-approved agreement between a company and its shareholders or creditors. Sebi, in November, had put in place operational guidelines

pertaining to "scheme of arrangement" by entities who have listed their debt securities non-convertible debentures (NCDs) or nonconvertible redeemable preference shares (NCRPS) Under this, the entity that has listed NCDs or NCRPS and which intends to undertake a scheme of arrangement or is involved in a scheme of arrangement would file the draft scheme with stock exchanges for obtaining a no-objection letter, before filing such scheme with any court or tribunal. Further, the exchange would have to forward such draft schemes to the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi)



SBI board to take call on raising capital via bonds

State Bank of India (SBI) said its board will meet on December 14 to decide on raising capital through Tier I bonds. As per a regulatory filing, SBI said it will seek "approval for raising of Additional Tier 1 (AT 1) capital by way of issuance of Basel III compliant debt instruments in INR and / or any other convertible currency through a

public offer or private placement to Indian and / or overseas investors up to March 31, 2024." The fundraise would help the bank grow its loan book. Earlier this week, SBI announced that its personal banking advances, excluding high value home loans, have crossed the Rs 5 lakh crore-mark. The country's largest lender took a year to book the last Rs 1 lakh crore of advances, as against over 15 months for the previous Rs 1 lakh crore and over 30 months for the Rs 1 lakh crore



Govt selects 67 entries with Rs 42.500 crore investment potential under PLI scheme

he government has selected a total of 67 entries with an investment potential of Rs 42,500 crore under the production linked incentive (PLI) scheme for specialty steel. The proposed investments are expected to generate 70,000 job opportunities and add 26 million tonnes of speciality steel capacity in the country. A total of 79 applications were received from 35 small and large steel-making companies with investment commitments totalling Rs 46,000 crore to add downstream capacity of 28 million tonnes (MT) by 2030, the

steel ministry said in a statement. After several extensions, the final window for participation in the PLI scheme closed on September 15, 2022. "Sixty-seven applications from 30 companies have been selected. This will attract committed investment of Rs 42.500 crore with a downstream capacity addition of 26 MT and employment generation potential of 70,000," the ministry said. Applicants include all major steel players like Tata Steel, JSW Steel, JSPL, AMNS India and SAIL, a senior steel ministry official had



5G services started in 50 towns across 14 States/UTs as on Nov 26: MoS Devusinh

The fifth-generation or 5G telecom services have started in 50 towns distributed over 14 states/union territories as of November 26, Parliament was informed on Friday.

The Minister of State for Communications, Devusinh Chauhan, in a written reply in Rajya Sabha noted that telecom operators have started providing 5G services in the country from October 1, 2022.

Telecom Service Providers (TSPs) have started providing 5G services in the country from 01.10.2022 onwards and as of 26.11.2022, 5G services have started in 50 towns distributed over 14 States/ Union Territories," Chauhan said.

The minister was responding to a question on several glitches in 5G services and poor network.

Further, he said that as per rollout of telecom network



the bid document for auction of access spectrum and license conditions, the minimum rollout obligations are required to be met over a period of five years in a phased manner from the date of allocation of spectrum.The government has taken several policy initiatives to facilitate faster and smooth

(including 5G) and expansion of telecommunication infrastructure in the country. These include making sufficient spectrum available for mobile services through auction, allowing spectrum sharing and trading among others.

To another question, Chauhan said that Bharat Sanchar Nigam Ltd (BSNL) floated tender in October 2022 for its requirement of one lakh 4G sites

"BSNL floated Expression of Interest (EOI) on January 1, 2021 for the Proof of Concept (PoC). The PoC has been completed with few pending points. 5G Non Standalone Access (NSA) upgrade has also been kept as a deferred feature

Moreover, the government has reserved spectrum for BSNL for providing 5G services, he said. To a separate question on the losses of BSNL and MTNL (Mahanagar Telephone Nigam Ltd), the minister said that since incep-

tion, the total net loss of BSNL

is Rs 57,671 crore while that of

MTNL is Rs 14,989 crore as on

March 31, 2022. 'The reasons for losses of BSNL and MTNL are high employee cost over the years, debt burden, stiff competition in the market and lack of 4G services (except on a limited

basis in certain areas)," the

minister said.

BSNL and MTNL have become EBITDA (Earnings Before Interest, Taxes, Depreciation Amortisation) positive since the financial year 2020-21, as

a result of 2019 revival plan.

Forex kitty soars US\$ 11 bn to US\$ 561.16 billion

India's foreign exchange reserves soared by USD 11.02 billion to reach ÚSD 561.162 billion for the week ended December 2, Reserve Bank data showed on Friday.

This is the fourth consecutive week of rise in the reserves. In the previous reporting week, the overall reserves had grown by USD 2.9 billion to USD 550.14 billion. For the week ended November 11, the forex kitty had jumped by USD 14.72 billion in its second fastest weekly acceleration ever.

In October 2021, the country's foreign exchange kitty had reached an all-time high of USD 645 billion. The reserves have been declining as the central bank deploys the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressures caused majorly by global developments.

Foreign currency assets (FCA), a major component of the overall reserves, increased by USD 9.694 billion to USD 496.984 billion during the week to December 2, according to the Weekly Statistical Supplement released by the RBI on Friday.

NTT India to invest US\$ 2 billion in data centres

NTT India has earmarked around USD 2 billion to boost information and communications technology infrastructure in the country over the next three-four years, aiming to tap the rise in data consumption, a top company official said.

New data centres, cloud computing, submarine cable landing stations and solar parks are key areas where NTT India's capex is planned, he said."We will invest USD 500 million annually for the next four years in India. This is over and above the USD 800 million we have already infused in the last two years into ICT infrastructure,"

NTT India MD & Sr EVP (Global Data Centres & Marine Cables) Sharad Sanghi told PTI.He was speaking on the sidelines of the ABP Grouporganised INFOCOM 2022.

The Indian arm of Japanese IT services major NTT Data Inc is also exploring the idea of setting up a submarine cable landing station in Kolkata, Sanghi said. The company will roll out submarine cable landing stations, which are physical locations where one or more submarine telecommunication cables connect to land-based power and networking infrastructure, in Mumbai and Chennai by next year.

Riding the wave of modernity while

keeping tradition in mind

The love that the Indians have for the age-old tradition of having paan or betel leaf is inseparable. The tradition of paan has a history of over 5000 years. Be it ancient Indian mythology or Ayurveda, it can be for the page 100 found everywhere with its effective medicinal values.

In fact, one of Bollywood's most iconic songs from *Don* by *Shahenshah* of the B-Town Amitabh Bachchan says, "Khaike paan Banaras waala khul jaaye band akal ka taala" (After eating the Banaras paan, the mind's lock opens).

You might have guessed by now what we are going to talk about today. But, hey, no! Were not going to talk about the history or benefits, but take you through the journey of how Prem Raheja's real-life incidents made him come up with the age-old tradition of paan with a modern twist.

Around six years ago, Prem envisioned the idea to start The Betel Leaf Co. But we wondered, how did he get the idea? He begins to share, "Prior to this, I had a couple of other businesses due to which I had to travel across the world. Due to the different timings and odd hours of a meal, I suffered from a severe bloating issue which was uncomfortable most of the day. When I came back, I went to a dietitian/nutritionist. They had later

come to the conclusion to have some basic changes in diet and bring in food. One of the dieticians had also suggested that I have a pan after every meal, and that's actually where the journey started."

It was similar to how we do not get the same food taste at every restaurant, it was the same when we go to have paan. And, every time that he was not personally present, they would simply put in any ingredient that was not supposed to be used. This made him want to have a saada pan, but he had to reverse the customization.

In a nutshell, even if women want to have paan, which is a male-dominated purchase, they cannot just go and buy it, as was also the case in Prem's case. And, also with the improper packaging of paan, it triggered him to come up with The Betel Leaf Co.

"The most important question that was raised was how do we take it to the people in a more comfortable place with a better experience. Then we bought various flavours because we are simply not in the business of deciding what food people eat, but can we relive this whole Indian tradition of bringing out the pan, which in the past the Rajas Maharajas gave pan to only people who enjoyed their dinner with.

They offer over 45 flavours, including chocolate, coffee, and rasmalai. In

fact, their products also include paaninfused chocolate bars and ice creams, with an aim to bring the essence and benefits of paan to the whole family. But that's not it! Tea lovers, they have something for you all too. Headquartered in Bengaluru, they have stores in different cities, including Hyderabad, Ahmedabad, Pune, Mumbai, Gurgaon, and Delhi. How could we not remember the experience in the city of pearls? And during this, we found out that Prem has always been associated with Hyderabad.

"We started the business in Hyderabad over 13 months back, and we currently have three stores; Sindhi Colony, Banjara Hills and Hitech city. We chose Hyderabad because my maternal side family has been in Hyderabad and I spent most of my childhood summer holidays in Hyderabad. As a kid also, we saw that the city had a great paan eating crave and I've had the maximum number of paans even as a kid here. So, what

better than going into a city which has its heritage and Hyderabadis known for the city of nawabs and what can be more appropriate than the city. It's been an exciting journey," he says and continues, "Every city, every consumer is different. In Hyderabad, we didn't experience different questions from people but definitely kind of city which knows its paan really well." recognition that we've got from the

"Hyderabad is a fabulous city, and there's a lot of opportunities and more visibility that it can give us in terms of recognition, consistency, customers wanting to re-order with us, and being an important part of the weddings. If the love and motivation that we've got here weren't there, we wouldn't open three stores in such a short span."

In terms of future expansion, they intend to not only open over 100 stores by December 2023, but also to open international markets and experience centres in every major city in

INDIA STARE AT CLEAN SWEEP I've been working on my

struggling Indian team, severely depleted by a spate of onfield injuries and fitnessrelated problems, will be determined to avoid the ignominy of a clean sweep against Bangladesh in the final ODI of the three-match series here on Saturday.

Bangladesh, riding on two contrasting yet brilliant knocks from Mehidy Hasan Miraz, have already sealed the series after winning the first two matches but if Litton Das' men can blank the 'Men in Blue' 3-0, it will be a historic first in the country's cricket

Not only will it be an icing on the cake for the hosts but also significantly dent the visiting team's confidence ahead of the Test series, starting at this very venue in less than a week's time (December 14).

For India, there were 20 cricketers originally available for this series since there was a very short turnaround time between the first ODI in Bangladesh and the last game in New Zealand as some players in both squads were common.

But call it a cruel twist of fate as within a week things have gone from bad to worse and they only have 14 fit and available players to choose from for the final game.

Such has been the plight that Kuldeep Yadav has been flown into Chattogram on SOS basis as the Indian bowling attack looks thin on experience. The left-arm wrist spinner with 118 wickets from 72 ODIs will be the most experienced bowler

in the line-up.

Regular skipper Rohit Sharma sustained a left thumb dislocation and has flown back home. Up and coming pacer Kuldeep Sen suffered a back injury after playing his first international game. Seamer Deepak Chahar continued his saga of breaking down in almost all the series he has played since his comeback



from a long lay-off.

Add to this, Axar Patel suffered a hit in the ribs and missed the first game while Rishabh Pant, who flew all the way from New Zealand, reportedly had a niggle and had to be rested for excessive workload prior to this series. In fact, there will be two forced changes in the playing eleven with Rohit and Chahar already unavailable.

It is there to be seen whether India bring in Ishan Kishan into the playing XI as an opener or standin skipper KL Rahul, who is now a designated middle-order batterkeeper in this format, decides to promote himself just like during the tour of South Africa.

The other option is continuing with Virat Kohli-Shikhar Dhawan combination and get someone like Rahul Tripathi, who can also bowl some cutters at mid 120 clicks, in the playing XI. If the team management goes for a pure batter rather than a utility player, then the stylish Rajat Patidar could get his first game for

In case of Chahar's replace-

ment, there isn't a back-up pacer available and the team might not have an option but to fall back to allrounder Shahbaz Ahmed, who could be the sixth bowling option.

India's five-pronged bowling attack will be Mohammed Siraj, Shardul Thakur, Umran Malik, Washington Sundar and Axar Patel. With no Jasprit Bumrah,

Mohammed Shami and Ravindra Jadeja, the Indian bowling unit's performance at the back-end has been far from impressive.

While a full-strength Bangla-

desh will start as favourites in the

final game, the bigger worry will be KL Rahul, the skipper. His record, save in the ODI series win against a below-par Zimbabwe, has been dismal and the last thing he would need is another clean sweep defeat against his name after the tour of South Africa.

Till now, there has been little or no indication that Rahul is a longtime future India captain, not having displayed any above average leadership acumen in the matches that he has captained so far.

Saurabh has staked a strong claim to replace an injured Ravindra Jadeja in the Indian Test squad for the upcoming series against Bangladesh, starting December 14.

Having conceded a mam-moth 310-run first innings

lead, Bangladesh 'A' performed even worse in their second innings, being shot out for a paltry 187 in 79.5 overs.

In the first innings, Bangladesh were a shade better, scoring 252 and India replied with a massive 562, riding on skipper Abhimanyu Easwaran's superb 157.

Saurabh, who also had a five-wicket haul in the second innings of the drawn first Test', took 6 for 74 in 30 overs to become one of the architects

The Uttar Pradesh spinner also finished with a haul of 15

scalps in two games to emerge as the top wicket-taker in the series. Bangladesh 'A', with seasoned former skipper Mominul Haque in their ranks, were expecting to bat it out for three sessions and eke out a draw.

However, Mominul (6) was smartly snapped up behind stumps by keeper Kona Bharat in the fifth over of the morning and there was no looking back for India 'A'.

Opener Shadman Islam (93 not out) did fight it out and also had a 54-run fourth wicket stand with Shahadat Hossain (29) but Saurabh broke that stand with Yash Dhull taking a catch. Navdeep Saini (2/54 in 16

overs), who was given an extended spell because of his possible call-up to the senior squad, then got two wickets in three deliveries to send half of the home side packing. He first trapped Jaker Ali leg-before and then had Yashasvi Jaiswal pouch Mohammed Mithun in the slips to reduce Bangladesh 'A' to 145 for 6.

Saurabh then quickly polished off the tail to set up a nice win as Umesh Yadav (2/34 in 15.5) completed the proceed-


The top two players in each group will make it to the knockout stage. Prannoy is the lone Indian competing in the seasonending tournament.



Blurr: A Gruesome-thrilling entertainer

Zee5's Blurr, based on Spanish horror and psychological thriller Julia's eye marks Taapsee Pannu's debut as a film producer. Helmed by director Ajay Bahl, written by Pawan Sony and Ajay Bahl, the adaptation stars Taapsee Pannu in a dual role while Gulshan Devaiah, Abhilash Thapliyal, Sorabh Chauhan, Kritika Desai, et al can be seen playing other important

The movie starts with Gautami(played by Taapsee Pannu), a blind woman seemingly in a distributed state questioning in a high pitch with rap music overlapping her speech. We can sense that something is wrong and then the camera cuts to the nooze. The story is about twin sisters Gayatri and Gautami; both struggle from a degenerative eye disease and while the opening scene plays out the narrative shifts to a heated conversation between Neel and Gayatri. Whilst the latter argues that she

partner Neel calms her down. The couple reach Gautami's res-

idence and find her dead. Even here, Neel unflinchingly asks her to calm down, a trait which occurs on multiple occasions. While the cops reassure that Gautami's demise is due to suicide and not a planned murder, Gayatri sets out her own journey to solve the mystery despite her progressive vision loss catching

Kudos to cinematographer (Sudhir K Chaudhary) for enhancing the overall viewing experience of the film. As the camera lurks and lingers around the actors, sometimes slowly pushing in to reflect the inner state of the characters and at other times hanging around to reveal the claustrophobic eerie locations and rooms. The intentional use of a grim colour palette works really well in the context of the story while the sleek editing ramps up the pace at the right moments. Director and writer Ajay Bahl structures the narrative rather interestingly by informing the audience about the deceased sister needs to go see her twin sister, her through Gayatri' inquisitiveness acter with utmost conviction and

to solve the puzzle. The point of view shots play out really well in showing Gayatri's gradual vision

One of the most spine chilling scenes plays out in the first act of the film in a centre for the visually impaired where Gayatri is caught eavesdropping on the blind women. The patients creepily surround her and after finding out who she is, they warn her of the presence of another man in the room. From this moment on, it's a constant classic cat and mouse chase between the known and unknown.

When she completely loses her vision, some of Gayatri' nightmares metaphorically give us a hint of her separation anxiety. When Gayatri suspects someone might have entered the house, her caretaker says, "Maybe some animal must have entered!". The dialogues cleverly keep us guessing throughout the film. You can't help but empathise with her character. You want her to naturally triumph over evil. Taapsee plays the char-

the restrictive narrative device used by the director allows her performance to come through in the best way possible. Gulshan Devaiah as the caring nurse of Gayatri charms you like a snake with his performance.

As the story unfolds, the music intensifies and so does our anxiety. The art and sound departments deserve a special shoutout for making the immersive experience worth the time. The film delivers what it promises, the thrilling elements find their way in the most unusual ways and loom over us long after the film ends. If you are a sucker for thrillers of any kind, Blurr is for you. Remember to watch it on a bright Saturday afternoon. I say afternoon because if you watch it at night, those creepy chills are guaranteed. The film has a lot of gruesome sequences, jump scares, twists and turns, and above all, Blurr is technically sound with some extraordinary performances from the
