Speaker disqualifies 12 MLAsTN RAGHUNATHA ■

Having lobbed the ball into Maharashtra's Deputy Speaker Narhari Sitaram Zirwal's court in their own tactful ways, the rebel Eknath Shinde camp and the ruling Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) constituents on Friday prepared themselves to play an active part in the procedural tangles that will unfold in the run-up to the confidence vote that the Uddhav dispensation may seek sometime next week.

Deputy Speaker Zhirwal, who has been acting as the Assembly Speaker since February 2021 in the absence of a full-fledged speaker, will have a tough task on hand in dealing with the claims and counter-claims to be made by the Shinde camp and the MVA Government.

Given the complex nature of the emerging situation and the ramifications of the anti-defection law that will come into play in the coming days, the matters relating to the possible disqualifications of MLAs may land in courts, leading to the delay in the resolution of the current political crisis in Maharashtra.

Taking the first step, Deputy Speaker Narhari recognised the decision taken by the parent Shiv Sena Legislature Party (SSLP) on June 21 sacking the rebel Sena leader and Minister Shinde as the Sena

group leader in the State Assembly and replacing him with its senior party functionary Ajay Choudhury.

The recognition of the parent Sena leadership's decision to appoint Choudhary as the new SSLP leader in place of Shinde means that the Deputy Speaker has a strong reason to believe that the parent has enough numbers to act in a manner it has done.

The chair's ruling allowing the appointment of Choudhary as the new SSLP leader has ticked off the rebel Shinde camp, which is preparing to challenge the deputy speaker's order in the Bombay High Court on Saturday morning.

On its part, the rebel Sena camp on Thursday submitted a fresh letter to the Deputy Speaker that 37 rebel Shiv Sena MLAs camping in Guwahati (which is more than the requisite two-third strength i.e., 36 MLAs out of total 55 Sena MLAs in the State Assembly) reaffirming that Shinde would continue as the Sena group leader in the State Assembly. Till Friday evening, the Deputy Speaker had not accepted the claim that the Shinde camp enjoyed the support of 37 Sena MLAs.

If the Deputy Speaker accepts the rebel Sena camp's claim that Shinde enjoys the support of 37 out of the total 55 Sena MLAs in the Assembly and declares him as the Sena legislature party leader, the



parent party will be as good as over. Because, the Shinde faction — if it has two-thirds of the parent party's strength in the Assembly — can merge with another party or become a separate group in the House without attracting penal provisions of the anti-defection law.

On the other hand, the parent Sena party is hoping against hope that the Deputy Speaker will disqualify 12 MLAs, including Eknath Shinde, for allegedly violating the party whip, based on a written request made to that effect by the parent Sena's new SSLP leader Ajay Choudhury on Thursday.

If the Deputy Speaker disqualifies 12 Sena rebel MLAs, including Shinde, the development will result in the rebel Sena camp — the strength of which will be reduced to 25 Sena MLAs against the earlier 37 MLAs — attracting action under the anti-defection law.

If such development takes place, the 12 disqualified Sena rebel MLAs will not be able to take part in the confidence vote to be sought by the Thackeray dispensation. It remains to be seen if the remaining 25 Sena rebel MLAs will vote against the confidence vote and if yes, whether they will face action under the anti-defection law.

Till the confidence vote is over, the Deputy Speaker will deal with all matters relating to the strength of the ruling MVA — comprising Shiv Sena (55) NCP (53), and Congress (44) — that had collective strength of 152 MLAs on paper till the Shinde-led rebellion rocked the Shiv Sena on June 21. However, after the confidence vote is decided, Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari will take control of the situation.

Governor Koshyari, who was admitted to the Reliance Foundation Hospital on Wednesday after he tested pos-

itive for Covid-19, will remain in hospital for some more days.

It remains to be seen if Koshyari, despite being in hospital, will intervene in matters which come under the domain of the Deputy Speaker.

Meanwhile, all the three MVA constituents — Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress — are rooting for Uddhav Thackeray seeking a confidence vote on the floor of the Assembly.

On Thursday, NCP chief Sharad Pawar — who is the architect of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) Government, said that the floor test was the only way to resolve the current political crisis. He expressed optimism that the MVA dispensation would survive the current crisis facing the Shiv Sena. "Let the MLAs come back from Guwahati. The situation will change drastically. The MVA Government will survive the floor test in the State Assembly," Pawar said.

J&K to host G-20 leaders;  
diplomatic win post Art 370UT has set up  
5-member high

Come 2023, the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir will be extending a red carpet welcome to the G-20 leaders, an influential grouping that brings together the world's major economies.

This major development is already seen as a major diplomatic victory for India especially after the abrogation of Article 370 and 35-A in August 2019.

India has been a member of G-20 since its inception in 1999. New Delhi will be holding the G-20 Presidency from 1 December 2022 and will convene the G-20 Leaders' Summit in 2023 for the first time.

World leaders of G-20 member nations — the United States, Russia, China, Germany, France, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, South Korea, Turkey, and the United Kingdom — are expected to attend the meeting.

G-20 brings together 19 of



the world's leading economies and the European Union, with its members accounting for more than 80 per cent of global GDP, 75 per cent of global trade and 60 per cent of the global population.

The UT administration is scheduled to host the world leaders in Kashmir valley. To facilitate the meeting, the UT administration has already constituted a five-member high level committee for overall coordination.

In September last year, Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal was appointed as India's Sherpa for the G-20. The Ministry of External Affairs had said that India will hold the G-20 presidency from December 1, 2022, and will convene the G-20 leaders' summit in 2023 for the first time.

According to an official

order issued here on Thursday, the Union Territory's housing and urban development department principal secretary will be the chairman of the committee which was formed in response to a June 4 communication from the Ministry of External Affairs.

"Sanction is hereby accorded to the constitution of a committee...for overall coordination of G-20 meetings to be held in the Union Territory of J&K," said the order issued by Principal Secretary, General Administration Department, Manoj Kumar Dwivedi. The members of the committee include Commissioner Secretary (Transport), Administrative Secretary (Tourism), Administrative Secretary (Hospitality and Protocol) and Administrative Secretary (Culture).

SC rejects Jafri's  
plea against SIT's

Upholding the SIT's clean chit to Narendra Modi in Gujarat riots of 2002, the Supreme Court on Friday dismissed Zakia Jafri's petition alleging conspiracy at the highest level, observing that these are attempts to "keep the pot boiling" for years and abuse of process with ulterior design.

Bringing the curtains down on the bid to reopen the probe, a bench headed by Justice AM Khanwilkar said the material collected during the investigation did not "give rise to strong or grave suspicion regarding hatching of larger criminal conspiracy at the highest level" for causing mass violence against Muslims.

The bench, also comprising Justices Dinesh Maheshwari and CT Ravikumar termed the petition of Congress MP Ehsan Jafri's widow as "the devious stratagem to keep the pot boiling, obviously, for ulterior design" and said all those involved in "such abuse of process need to be in the dock and proceeded with in accordance with law". The court said

the present proceedings (by Zakia Jafri) have been pursued for the last 16 years with the audacity to question the integrity of every functionary involved in the process.

The apex court also said that disgruntled officers of the Gujarat Government need to be in the dock and proceeded with in accordance with law for creating a sensation by making false revelations on the 2002 riots. The top court also said it finds force in the argument of the State that the testimony of Sanjiv Bhatt (then IPS officer and now in jail for custodial torture) and RB Sreekumar (now retired IPS officer) was only to sensationalise and politicise the matters in issue, "although, replete with falsehood".

"At the end of the day, it appears to us that a coalesced effort of the disgruntled officials of the State of Gujarat along with others was to create a sensation by making revelations which were false to their own knowledge. The falsity of their claims had been fully exposed by the SIT after a thorough investigation," said the apex court.

SC upholds  
death to minor

The Supreme Court on Friday sent to gallows a man for kidnapping, raping, and killing a seven-and-half-year-old mentally and physically challenged girl in 2013, saying the crime was of the nature of "extreme depravity which shocks the conscience" and left "no other option but to confirm the death sentence".

The apex court upheld the death sentence given by the Rajasthan High Court to convict Manoj Pratap Singh

"We may sum up thus: In the case of the present nature, the crime had been of extreme depravity, which shocks the conscience, particularly looking to the target (a seven-and-a-half-year old mentally and physically challenged girl) and then, looking to the manner of committing murder, where the hapless victim's head was literally smashed, resulting in multiple injuries, including a fracture of frontal bone..." said a bench of Justices AM Khanwilkar, Dinesh Maheshwari and CT Ravikumar.

Condemned convict Manoj Pratap Singh, then 28 years of age, had kidnapped the physically and mentally challenged minor girl in front of her parents from their fruit and vegetable vending cart on January 17, 2013, brutally raped her at a secluded place before killing her by smashing the head in Rajasmand district, Rajasthan.

The bench rejected the contention that in the case, hinging on circumstantial evidence, the death penalty should not be awarded saying that if the conviction can be sustained on such proof then the extreme penalty can also be imposed depending on the nature of the offence.

"In the present case, where all the elements surrounding the offence as also all the elements surrounding the offender cut across the balance sheet of aggravating and mitigating circumstances, we are clearly of the view that there is absolutely no reason to commute the sentence of death to any other sentence of lesser degree," Justice Maheshwari said.

Shinde's U-turn:  
No national party  
in touch with us

A day after claiming that a "powerful national party" was supporting his group of MLAs in the ongoing political drama in Maharashtra, Shiv Sena rebel Eknath Shinde on Friday said no national party is in contact with them.

Asked if BJP was backing his group, Shinde told a TV channel, "When I said a big power is backing us, I meant the power of Balasaheb Thackeray and (late Shiv Sena leader) Anand Dighe."

Responding to a query on when will the political crisis in Maharashtra end, Shinde, a minister in the Uddhav Thackeray-led Government in the state, said things will be clear after some time. "Out of 55 Shiv Sena MLAs, 40 have come with me to Guwahati. In a democracy, the majority and numbers count," he said.

Daily Covid count shoots up  
to 4-month high to over 17KPIONEER NEWS SERVICE ■

India on Friday reported a single-day count of over 17,000 fresh Covid-19 cases after a gap of over four months (124 days), recording a 30 per cent jump in daily cases.

A total 17,336 coronavirus cases were reported in a span of 24 hours, taking the total infection tally to 4,33,62,294, while the death toll due to the disease climbed to 5,24,954 with 13 new fatalities being reported, according to the Union Health Ministry data.

The national Capital recorded 1,447 new Covid cases and one more death on

Friday, while the positivity rate dropped to 5.98 per cent. These fresh cases were recorded out of 24,203 tests conducted the previous day. The infection tally in Delhi has risen to 19,28,841 and the death toll stands at 26,243.

Delhi had recorded 1,934 Covid cases and zero death on Thursday, while the positivity rate had stood 8.10 per cent.

Fresh cases dropped slightly from 858 cases on Thursday to 816 cases on Friday in Karnataka. At the national level, the daily positivity rate was recorded at 4.32 per cent and the weekly positivity rate at 3.07 per cent, according to the Health

Ministry.

The count of active cases has increased to 88,284, comprising 0.20 per cent of the

total infections, while Covid-19 recovery rate at the national level was recorded at 98.59 per cent, it said.



## States can ban abortion, rules US SC

The US Supreme Court has ended Constitutional protections for abortion that had been in place nearly 50 years in a decision by its conservative majority to overturn Roe v. Wade. Friday's outcome is expected to lead to abortion bans in roughly half the States.

The ruling is the culmination of decades of efforts by abortion opponents, made possible by an emboldened right side of the court that has been fortified by 3 picks of former President Donald Trump.

It puts the court at odds with a majority of Americans who favored preserving Roe, according to opinion polls. The ruling came more than a month after the stunning leak of a draft opinion by Justice Samuel Alito indicating the court was prepared to take this momentous step. See P9

Some of MPs and MLAs who are proposers and seconders include Union Tribal Affairs Minister and Khunti MP Arjun Munda, State BJP president and Rajya Sabha MP Deepak Prakash, BJP national president of ST Morcha and Rajya Sabha MP Samir Oroan, Lohardaga MP

and former union minister Sudarshan Bhagat, Dumka MP Sunil Soren, BJP MLA from Khunti Neelkanth Singh Munda among others.

The BJP has prepared four set of nominations for Murmu's candidature. Besides the Prime Minister, senior Union ministers Rajnath Singh, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, BJP national president JP Nadda are signatories on the nomination papers. Every set of nomination has to have 50 proposers and 50 seconders among elected representatives.

The State BJP MPs who became proposers are happy to become part of this historic moment. Union tribal affairs minister Arjun Munda said, “It is a historic moment that a tribal woman who has roots with tribal culture and custom is going to hold Country's top constitutional post.”

BJP Rajya Sabha MP Sameer Oroan said, “It makes

Murmu, a grassroots politician, has many firsts to her credit. She was the first woman and tribal leader from Odisha to be appointed as

governor of any state. She served as the governor of Jharkhand from 2015 to 2021, the first governor to complete the term in the state.

Murmu's term as Governor has remained uncontroversial. As Governor she returned the controversial acts making amendments in Chhotanagpur Tenancy Act (CNT) and Santhal Pragana Tenancy Act(SPT) in view of

widespread violent agitation by tribals in the state. The amendments act were brought by the then Raghubar Das government.

Earlier, Murmu was also accompanied by Union Ministers Amit Shah, Rajnath Singh, Nitin Gadkari and Piyush Goyal, BJP president J.P. Nadda and several chief ministers including Yogi Adityanath, Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Manohar Lal Khattar, B.S. Bommai, Bhupendra Patel, Himanta Biswa Sarma, Pushkar Singh Dhami, Pramod Sawant and N Biren Singh. Besides the NDA leaders, YSR Congress' V. Vijaysai Reddy and BJD leader Sasmit Patra, who are not part of the alliance, were also in Parliament to back her nomination.

AIADMK leader O. Panneerselvam and M. Thambidurai, JD-U's Rajiv Ranjan Singh also reached Parliament early.

## Govt sanctions record Rs 226 crore KCC loans in a day

In an attempt to empower the farmers of the State economically, the Agriculture Department of the State Government sanctioned Rs 226 crore Kisan Credit Card (KCC) loan in one day on June 23 which is a new record in itself. This is the result of co-ordination and hard work between the team of the Agriculture Department and the Bank Officer. KCC has proved to be a boon for the farmers of the State.

The result of the camp organized by the Government on June 23 is that 49,092 KCC applications were received in just one day till late evening and an amount of Rs 22669.99815 lakh was sanctioned for the loans of the beneficiaries.

Oraon said that following the instructions of Chief Minister, Hemant Soren, Mega KCC distribution camp was organized in all the blocks of the State on June 23 so that more and more farmers can be covered with KCC. “Even before this, on June 08, 2022, Mega KCC distribution camp was organized at the district level in all the districts of the State. The

farmers of the State can take advantage of the scheme by coming to the camp organized in their block,” she added.

“The farmers are being provided loans at easy rates for farming through KCC. With this, while farmers are getting help in farming, they are also getting freedom from the clutches of moneylenders. Soren has been very sensitive

about the farmers. He has given instructions that maximum farmers of the State should be connected with KCC and its benefits should be ensured,” said Oraon.

The Director Agriculture further said that the loan linked to the KCC is available to farmers at 7 percent interest, which is waived by the Government of India at 3 per cent interest if it is returned within the time limit. “In this direction, keeping in view the economic condition of the farmers here, the State Government is helping by giving 3 per cent interest on their return on time. In this way, if the loan is returned by the farmer within the time limit, the farmer has to bear the burden of only 1 per cent interest. So far, KCC of 8,96,108 farmers has been achieved

with the efforts of the State Government. The application form was taken by organizing a camp at the Panchayat level,” she added.

“Out of total population of the State 70 per cent population lives in villages and their main source of livelihood is agriculture. In such a situation, it is necessary that the farmers of the State should be provided capital for agricultural purposes such as fertilizers, seeds, pesticides, agricultural implements and other requirements related to agriculture. In this direction, the State Government has decided that KCC should be made available to all the farmers of the State, so that the farmers can fulfill their agricultural needs from time to time,” said Oraon.

## Drone cameras on surveillance during Rath Mela in city

## Jharkhand HC defers Ranchi riot PIL till July 8

The Jharkhand High Court Friday deferred the hearing of PIL seeking NIA probe of June 10 violence till July 8. During the previous hearing held on June 17, the bench of Chief Justice Dr. Ravi Ranjan and Justice Sujit Narayan Prasad had directed the state government to file an affidavit about the riot in which two people died in the police action. But when the matter was listed for hearing on Friday, the Advocate General Rajiv Ranjan requested the court for more time to file the affidavit. The PIL was filed by Pankaj Kumar Yadav to seek investigation of this case by the NIA.

The court had directed the state government to explain how all of a sudden 10000 people turned up on the road

and violence got triggered. The court directed a detailed report about the number of casualties and injuries besides the round of bullets fired by the police.

The court demanded intelligence reports, claims about the attack on temples, and measures to control law and order. The court wanted to know whether or not other arrangements like tear gas and water cannon were made to tackle the situation.

Sectarian violence took place on June 10 when a strong mob pelted stones on the police and religious places. In the police action, two died whereas seven others were injured. Some po-

licemen were also injured in the clash.

Petitioner claimed that the riot was planned by the People's Front of India and SDPI. Some people from Saharanpur district of Uttar Pradesh secretly visited Ranchi to organize the violence in the name of the protest against the remarks of BJP leader Nupur Sharma. He also demanded the court to investigate the role of All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimen headed by Asaduddin Owaisi.

In another development Nadeem Ansari who suffered a bullet during the riot was airlifted to Delhi based Medanta Hospital. He was under treatment at RIMS where he was kept on ventilator support. Ranchi district administration made necessary arrangements for his airlifting.

## Covid cases once again on rise in State

**151 active cases till June 23**

Corona cases are once again on the rise in the State. On Thursday 36 fresh cases were found across the State with 21 fresh cases discovered in Ranchi district alone. With the rise in fresh cases, the number of active cases too has gone up. In the State the number of active cases has gone up to 151, with 90 cases in Ranchi alone.

However, relief is that leaving behind Ranchi, Deoghar and East Singhbhum the number of active cases in other districts is in single digit. In Ranchi the number of active cases is 90, while in Deoghar the number of active cases is 17 while at East Singhbhum the number of active cases is 19. However, the cause of concern is that testing has gone down. Presently, around 3000 to 4000 samples are tested. In Ranchi district presently 400-500 samples are tested on a daily basis. Out of this on an average 10 fresh cases are detected.

In Ranchi district presently

corona sample tests are done only in Sadar Hospital. Also, there is no testing facility at Ranchi railway station and at Birsu Munda International Airport thus there is no scanning of passengers reaching Ranchi from other states or districts.

Experts claim that the state government should not be lenient in corona testing. Testing centers should be increased so that a large number of people are tested. Moreover, in view of rapidly rising Covid cases in Jharkhand, the state government has issued fresh guidelines and brought the mask mandate back. In a health ad-

visory issued by the government, the state released fresh rules for public places, schools and colleges and stressed social distancing in public places.

Now, one needs to wear masks in workplaces and while travelling on public transport. The order also stated that spitting is prohibited in public places.

Any person violating these guidelines will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the IPC and other legal provisions as applicable.

BJP president J P Nadda and several chief ministers including Yogi Adityanath, Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Manohar Lal Khattar, B S Bommai, Bhupendra Patel, Himanta Biswa Sarma, Pushkar Singh Dhami, Pramod Sawant and N Biren Singh were also present..

Every set of presidential nominations has to have 50 proposers and 50 seconders among elected representatives. Besides the NDA leaders, YSR Congress V Vijaysai Reddy and BJD leader Sasmit Patra, who are not part of the alliance, were also in Parliament to support her nomination. AIADMK leader O Paneerselvam and M Thambidurai, JD-U's Rajiv Ranjan Singh were also present on the occasion.

The Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM), a tribal party, which until now is supporting the Joint-opposition-consensus candidate and former Minister in the Vajpayee gov-



ernment Yashwant Sinha, is also likely to "review" its stand and back the NDA's 'Santhani' leader from Odisha, sources said. NDA's nomination of a tribal leader has put JMM in a spot.

Murmu, the former governor of Jharkhand, if elected, will be the first tribal president and the second woman in the post. She will also be the youngest president ever, second only to N Sanjeeva Reddy, who was a few days older to her when he became the President.

Pratibha Patil became the first woman president of India in 2007 under the Congress-led-UPA government. Meanwhile, Murmu on Friday called up key opposition leaders, including Congress chief Sonia Gandhi,

NCP's Sharad Pawar and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, and sought their support for her candidature. All the three leaders expressed their best wishes to her, sources said. The counting of votes will take place on July 21.

Murmu, the NDA candidate is expected to clinch the post in her contest against Sinha with ease thanks to additional support from regional parties like BJD, JDU and YSR Congress.

The president is elected by members of electoral college consisting of elected members of both houses of Parliament and elected members of the legislative assemblies of all states including national capital territory of Delhi and Union territory of Puducherry.

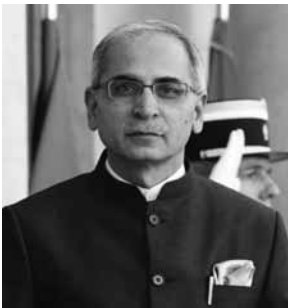
# Energy security understood by all nations: Kwatra

India is procuring crude oil from Russia to ensure its national energy security and this position is well understood by many countries, Foreign Secretary Vinay Mohan Kwatra said here on Friday.

His assertion came days ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi travelling to Germany to take part in the G-7 summit on June 26-27. The ongoing military action by Russia in Ukraine is likely to come up during the deliberations.

Many western nations have imposed sanctions against Russia. Kwatra justified India's position while replying to a question on what will be India's approach if New Delhi faces criticism during the upcoming



G-7 summit for its procurement of Russian crude oil. The Foreign Secretary said India's consideration for crude oil purchases has been very well understood by the global community. "India's consideration for crude oil purchases is very well understood. It is appreciated across the countries. I do not see that as any point of assuming any pressure," the Foreign Secretary

said. Kwatra also said "whatever are the trading arrangements that India puts in place with regard to the purchase of crude oil all over the world is determined purely by the consideration of energy security in India." Modi will visit the Alpine castle of Schloss Elmau in southern Germany on June 26 and 27 to attend the annual summit of G7 countries.

From Germany, Modi will travel to the United Arab Emirates(UAE) on June 28 to pay his condolences on the passing away of Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, the former president of the Gulf nation.

Giving details of the Prime Minister's schedule at a media briefing, Kwatra said India's regular participation at G-7 summits clearly points to increasing acceptance of the

country's role to find a solution to solve key global challenges. The Foreign Secretary said Russia-Ukraine situation has generated food security crisis over the world.

India has taken a proactive stance that food security of vulnerable countries is addressed and India's food security is also not impacted. There has been an appreciation of India's position.

On the Prime Minister's visit to the UAE on way back to India, Kwatra said India and UAE relations are dynamic, robust and widespread. "Energy security is an important pillar of our relations. People-to-people connect is another aspect.

Security, environment, education and investment are other areas of discussion between the two countries," he

said. The Foreign Secretary said Modi's visit to the UAE will focus on two main issues. Firstly to pay condolences on the passing away of former UAE President and Abu Dhabi Ruler Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan.

Secondly, to congratulate Sheikh Mohammad bin Zayed Al Nahyan for becoming President of the UAE.

On the issue of controversial remarks against Prophet Mohammad leading to protests in many Gulf countries, Kwatra said almost all Middle East countries have an understanding of India's position.

"We have communicated our stand on various platforms. I do not think that will be taken forward anymore," he added. Modi is visiting the country for the first time after the controversy.

# IAF starts recruitment process under Agnipath scheme

The IAF on Friday started the recruitment process under the recently announced Agnipath scheme. The Army had started the process earlier this week while the Navy will commence the recruitment this weekend.

"Registration window to apply for #Agniveervayu is operational from 10 am today," the IAF said on Twitter.

The candidates will have to register online and then clear an online examination. Those successful will then undergo physical fitness and medical tests for final selection. The Navy also follows same system. So far more than 4,000 aspirants had registered for the IAF

examination, sources said.

The Agnipath scheme to recruit jawans to be known as Agniveers on contractual basis was rolled out on June 14. It led to mass protests in many parts of the country.

The government, however, ruled out rolling it back and termed the scheme as "transformative" to ensure youthful profile and technology savvy armed forces to fight modern day war. Unveiling the Agnipath scheme, the government had said aspirants between the ages of 17-and-a-half and 21 years will be inducted for a four-year tenure. After completion of this stint, 25 per cent of them will be selected for regular service of 15 years or more with full pension benefits. Several parts of

the country witnessed violent protests against the scheme. A number of opposition parties and military experts had slammed the scheme, contending it will adversely impact the operational capabilities of the armed forces.

The government had on June 16 increased the upper age limit for recruitment under the scheme to 23 years from 21 for the year 2022 as a one time waiver. It said the decision was taken as recruitment was put on hold for the last two years due to the corona pandemic.

The Army has said the new scheme will ensure a youthful profile of the defence forces and result in reduction of the average age of soldiers from 32 to 26 years over a period of time.

# Won't take coercive action against Karti, ED tells HC

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Friday orally assured the Delhi High Court that no coercive action will be taken against Congress MP Karti P Chidambaram till July 12, when his anticipatory bail plea in the alleged Chinese Visas scam will be taken up for hearing.

Justice Jasmeet Singh also asked the ED to file a status report on the matter before the next date of hearing.

Additional Solicitor General SV Raju, representing the ED, orally assured the court that nothing will happen till July 12, next hearing.

"I will not make a statement but it is understood that nothing will happen till then.

My understanding is only till the 12th (of July)," he said, adding that there is no apprehension of the arrest. Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for Karti, urged the court to grant interim protection from arrest to Karti till the next date of hearing.

Karti had approached the High Court after his anticipatory bail plea and that of two others was dismissed by the trial court on June 3 on the ground that the offence was of a very serious nature.

Following CBI's FIR, the ED registered the money laundering case against Karti and others in the alleged scam pertaining to the issuance of a visa to 263 Chinese nationals in 2011 when his father P Chidambaram was the Home Minister.

# 5 newly-elected MPs take oath in Rajya Sabha

New Delhi: Rajya Sabha Chairman M Venkaiah Naidu on Friday administered oath to five newly-elected MPs from Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Odisha. The oath was administered in Rajya Sabha chamber in Parliament House.

Those who took oath are Niranjan Reddy Sirgapor and Ryaga Krishnaiah (both of YSRCP) from Andhra Pradesh, Damodar Rao Divakonda and B Parthasaradhi Reddy (both of TRS) from Telangana and Niranjan Bishi (of BJD) from Odisha.

While Krishnaiah, Divakonda and Reddy took oath in Telugu, Sirgapor did so in English. Bishi has been elected to Rajya Sabha in bypoll to fill casual vacancy caused in Rajya Sabha due to resignation of Subhash Chandra Singh. He took oath in Oriya. Rajya Sabha deputy chairman Harivansh and Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs and External Affairs V Muraleedharan, Secretary-General of Rajya Sabha P C Mody and other senior officers of Rajya Sabha Secretariat were present.

# SC upholds SIT clean chit on Guj riots: Thakur, other BJP leaders say 'Satyamev Jayate'

The BJP in unison chanted "Satyamev Jayate" after the Supreme Court on Friday upheld the Special investigation (SIT)'s clean chit to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and 63 others in the Gujarat riots of 2002, when he was the State's Chief Minister, and dismissed a plea by slain Congress leader Ehsan Jafri's wife Zakia alleging a larger conspiracy.

Welcoming the judgment, BJP leader and Union minister Anurag Thakur said, "Satyamev Jayate! Similar was the response of other party leaders who tweeted soon after the Supreme Court delivered the judgment.

"Satyamev Jayate," (Truth alone triumphs) was how another Union minister Smriti Irani also put it while party spokesperson Sambit Patra also tweeted the same expression. Describing the apex court's judgment as a "befitting reply to Modi haters", BJP spokesperson Shehzad Poonawala also said "The



truth always prevails. The magistrate had accepted the SIT closure report, it was upheld by the Gujarat High Court and upheld by the Supreme Court as well.

There is a cottage industry of Modi haters. They went to the extent of defaming Gujarat, defaming India, and today these people have got a resounding and befitting reply from the Supreme Court."

Another BJP spokesperson Gaurav Bhatia said, "The honourable Supreme court has given a verdict of great importance to everyone. And it shows that though justice has been delayed, it has not been denied. We welcome the judgement."

# Tapan Kumar Deka appointed IB Director

The Centre on Friday appointed Sri Lanka and Indo-China border expert Tapan Kumar Deka as the Director of the Intelligence Bureau (IB) and granted yet another one-year extension to Secretary of Research and Analysis Wing Samant Kumar Goel.

Deka, who has extensively handled operations wing of the agency was put in charge of the counter-terror assaults during the 26/11 Mumbai attack.

Deka will have a tenure of two years, according to an official order issued by the Personnel Ministry. He is a



1988-batch officer from the Himachal Pradesh cadre. He takes over from Arvinda Kumar, who will demit his office on June 30 after exhausting his one-year extension last year. The fate of A S Rajan, a 1987 batch IPS officer, Special



Director in IB, whom Deka has superseded was not known yet. He is retiring in February next year. The other Special Director Swagat Das was shifted on Thursday and posted as Special Secretary (Internal Security) in the Union Home

Ministry. The tenure of Samant Goel, who has been heading the Research and Analysis Wing (R&AW), has been extended by one more year, the ministry said in another order.

With this, Goel is the third R&AW chief who has got a tenure of more than three years. Earlier R N Kao, the founder chief of RAW served the agency for nine years followed by N F Suptnook who was at the helm of affairs for six years. Deka, considered to be an expert on the affairs of operations, especially in Kashmir as well as the Northeast, currently heads the operations wing of the IB, which he has

been serving for over two decades. He has a vast experience about terrorists and Islamic radicalisation in the country and had led the operations against the terror group Indian Mujahideen, which created mayhem through a series of bombings and other subversive activities across India in the 2000s.

Deka, who hails from Assam, was personally sent by Union Home Minister Amit Shah to his home State to handle the volatile situation that arose following the large-scale violence that rocked Assam after the enactment of the Citizenship Amendment Act in 2019.

# Parameswaran Iyer picked as CEO of Niti Aayog

The Centre on Friday appointed former Drinking Water and Sanitation Secretary Parameswaran Iyer, who spearheaded the Swachh Bharat Mission, as the CEO of Niti Aayog.

He will replace Amitabh Kant, who will demit office on June 30. Iyer has been appointed for two years or until further orders, whichever is earlier, said an order of the Personnel ministry.

According to the order, Iyer's appointment has been

made on the same terms and conditions as were applicable for Kant.

A 1981-batch IAS officer of Uttar Pradesh cadre, Iyer is a well-known sanitation specialist, and best known for spearheading Prime Minister Narendra Modi Government's flagship scheme Swachh Bharat Mission between 2016 and 2020.

Iyer had taken voluntary retirement from the Indian Administrative Service in 2009. He had also worked as a senior rural water sanitation specialist at the United

Nations. Outgoing Niti Aayog CEO Kant played a key role in Niti Aayog's policy making, with a focus on digital India, asset monetisation, disinvestment, aspirational districts programme and electric vehicles, among others.

He was appointed as the CEO of Niti Aayog on February 17, 2016, for a fixed two-year term. Kant was later given an extension till June 30, 2019. His term was further extended for two years till June 2021, and then another one-year extension was given till June 30 this year

# India assures support to Afghans amid crisis

India on Friday assured Afghanistan that it stood in solidarity with the Afghan people in the aftermath of the recent earthquake there, which killed more than 1,000 people. This message was conveyed after New Delhi sent 27 tons of relief material on Thursday and Friday to Kabul as a "first true responder."

India also sent a technical team to Kabul on Thursday to oversee humanitarian assistance to the strife torn country. The team is stationed at the Indian embassy there signalling that it may start functioning soon. The embassy was closed in August last year after the Taliban took control

of the country. The Taliban regime on Friday welcomed the move to station an Indian team in its embassy and said it "shows that a safe environment has been created in Afghanistan and all political and diplomatic rights are respected"

Abdul Qahar Balkhi, Taliban spokesperson, in tweets said: "The Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan welcomes India's decision to once again send a delegation of diplomats and a working team to its embassy in Kabul and wishes to continue its engagement and humanitarian assistance to the Afghan people." "The arrival of Indian diplomats in Afghanistan and the reactivation of the embassy shows that a safe environment

has been created in Afghanistan and all political and diplomatic rights are respected," he said.

"The Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan assures all existing embassies that the security of their embassies will be taken care of in accordance with international diplomatic principles," he said.

"The Islamic Emirate also calls on other countries to visit their diplomatic missions in Afghanistan and open their embassies," he said. An Indian team led by J P Singh, Joint Secretary (incharge Pakistan, Afghanistan and Iran division), ministry of external affairs, had recently visited Afghanistan and met Taliban Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi.

# Military strategists must not lose sight of primary objective of war-fighting, says IAF chief

India has to constantly update its national security strategy as the global order is being increasingly challenged with little or no regard to rules, IAF chief V R Chaudhari said here on Friday.

Making this point, he also said India must reassess its strategic priorities and realign its actions to ensure that it is not left behind adding that the military strategists must not lose sight of the primary objective of "war-fighting." His observations in a seminar came in the backdrop of India's lingering border row with China in eastern Ladakh, the situation in Afghanistan and the geopolitical upheavals triggered by the crisis in Ukraine.

Refraining from naming any country, the IAF chief said "coercion" is the new strategy with cyber, information and space domains becoming the "new battlefield".

"Today, we are witnessing a rapidly evolving international order that is increasingly being challenged by a complex multipolar world with little or no regard to rules or to the traditional processes of geopolitical interplays," he said. Chaudhari said diplomacy, economy and information are becoming the "primary tools" of engagement with the military instrument being used as a deterrent."Coercion is the new strategy with cyber, infor-



mation and space domains becoming the new battlefield. Therefore, we must reassess our strategic priorities and realign our actions to ensure we do not get left behind," he said.

The seminar marked the culmination of the first 'Warfare and Aerospace Strategy Programme' (WASP) was conducted by the Indian Air Force.

The WASP was rolled out with an aim to generate strategic thought and understanding amongst mid-career air power practitioners. Chaudhari hoped that the programme will enable the officers to understand the whole-of-government approach and generate independent opinions in dealing with national security issues.

"We believe that such cross-pollination of ideas from multiple disciplines can lead to critical thinking which allows a person to formulate solutions as well as take more rational and effective decisions," he said. "At the same time, a military strategist must not lose sight of the primary objective and that is war fighting.

# Address livelihood woes of people near ESZs: Rahul to PM

Former Congress president Rahul Gandhi has written to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, urging him to help address the concerns of those affected by the Supreme Court order on maintenance of Eco-Sensitive Zones (ESZ) around national parks and wildlife sanctuaries.

Sharing his letter to the prime minister in a Facebook post, Rahul said he has drawn his attention to the plight of the local communities of Kerala's Wayanad whose livelihoods will be adversely affected by the recent Supreme Court order.

"The state and the union governments can help by requesting dilution of a minimum width of an ESZ to the Central Empowered Committee (CEC) and the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC). The Supreme Court judgment considers rec-

ommendations made by the CEC and the MoEF&CC," the Lok Sabha MP from Wayanad in Kerala said in his Facebook post.

In his letter to the prime minister, Rahul Gandhi said he has also sent a missive to the Kerala chief minister on the issue. "I request the Union government to address these concerns in the larger public interest and reiterate our shared commitment to balancing conservation goals with our people's legitimate developmental needs," he said in the letter to Modi.

Recalling the recent judgement of the Supreme Court in the T N Godavarma Thirumulpad versus Union of India and others case, Gandhi said it mandates maintenance of an Eco-Sensitive Zone (ESZ) of one km around national parks and wildlife sanctuaries which has led to widespread protests around Wayanad parliamentary con-

stituency. "Local communities, still reeling under the impact of the Covid pandemic, have expressed grave concerns regarding the implications of this judgment on their lives and livelihoods.

The Guidelines for Declaration of Eco-Sensitive Zones around National Parks and Wildlife Sanctuaries dated February 9, 2011, as well as the above mentioned judgement prohibit certain activities in the ESZ. The ESZ Guidelines also regulate several activities, including, the change of agriculture systems, protection of hill slopes, and erection of electrical cables," he said.

The judgement, he noted, states that no permanent structure shall be permitted to come up for whatsoever purpose within the ESZ. "As one of the most densely populated regions in Western Ghats, such restrictions hamper the ability of local communities to improve their standard of living.

# SFI vandalises Rahul’s Wayanad office; 1 hurt

The office of Rahul Gandhi, an MP, at Wayanad came under attack from SFI activists on Friday, which resulted in Augustine Pulpalli, an office staff getting seriously injured. More than forty activists of the SFI, the student wing of the CPI-M gate-crashed into the office of the former chief of All India Congress Committee and vandalised the office properties. There were hardly five to six personnel who were present in the office at the time and they were chased out by the SFI activists.

The attack was in protest against the alleged indifference of the MP to interfere in the Supreme Court verdict dated June 3 ordering every protected forest, national park and wildlife sanctuaries across the country should have a mandatory eco-sensitive zone of a minimum one km starting from their demarcated boundaries.

But the office of Rahul Gandhi had said that he had written letters to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan asking the duo to file appeal against the verdict. There is a widespread apprehension

among the Christian and Muslim communities in the State that the apex court verdict would leave 1.5 lakh families living in these buffer zones stranded and without homes.

The Kerala Catholic Bishop Council and various Islamist organisations had issued statements condemning the court order immediately after the supreme Court verdict. Most of the districts in the State observed hartals and bundhs against the Supreme Court verdict.

The attack on Rahul Gandhi’s office resulted in Congress workers coming out condemning the incident. KC Venugopal, AICC General Secretary, lambasted the CPI-M led Kerala Government for the attack on Gandhi’s office.

“The Narendra Modi Government is after the blood of our young leader Rahul Gandhi and has been tormenting him by unleashing the Enforcement Directorate against him.

The Pinarayi Vijayan Government is aiding and abetting the Modi Government by vandalising Rahul Gandhi’s office. There is a secret deal between the Congress and the CPI-M to target Rahul Gandhi

# Flood situation in Assam critical; toll rises to 108

**Guwahati:** The flood situation in Assam was critical on Friday with 45.34 lakh people reeling under the deluge, officials said.

The Brahmaputra and Barak rivers along with their tributaries are in spate, even as floodwaters started receding from a few areas, they said.

The toll rose to 108 with seven deaths reported in the last 24 hours, they added.

The situation in Silchar, considered ‘Gateway to Barak Valley’, is alarming with most areas still under water, a district official said.

The Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) said that it has further expedited rescue and relief operations with additional resources deployed in the severely affected districts, especially Cachar where Silchar is located.

Eight NDRF teams with 207 personnel were brought in from Itanagar and Bhubaneswar, while an Army team with 120 members was sent in from Dimapur along with nine boats for the opera-

tions in Silchar, officials said.

Additionally, two CRPF and State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) teams were airlifted to Cachar, they added.

The state government has started a helpline -- 0361-2237219, 9401044617 and 1079 -- for the situation in the district.

Nearly 3 lakh people have been affected by an acute shortage of food, clean drinking water and medicines as almost the entire Silchar town is submerged in flood waters, officials said.

Food packets, water bottles and other essentials are being dropped by Air Force helicopters, they said. **PTI**

All tourists are welcomed in State: CM on Sena’s rebel MLAs’ stay in Assam

Asked about the ongoing political developments in Maharashtra, he said he cannot comment on it as it is a big state. “How can I comment on Maharashtra. It is a big state. I am happy that people are choosing Assam as a preferred destination,” he said.

On claims that his BJP-led Government was ignoring flood relief work and busy hosting the MLAs, the CM said he cannot order closure of hotels in capital due to floods in some parts of the State.

## ‘BRICS summit vital for post-Covid eco recovery’

The role of the BRICS forum is more important than ever for post-Covid global political economic recovery as also risk management in the global political economy, experts from Moscow and New Delhi said in an online discussion in the run up to the virtual BRICS summit.

“BRICS not only supports multi-polarity but can potentially strengthen commerce and trade relations especially when the world is facing economic challenges post-Covid. BRICS can contribute to global economic recovery not only to the economies of the BRICS countries but even non-BRICS countries,” said former Indian ambassador to Russia Bala Venkatesh Varma.

“The projected global economic growth is expected to be 2.5-2.9 per cent as against the usual 5.5 per cent growth rate before the Covid pandemic. However, India is expected to grow between 7 to 7.5 per cent. India can play a larger role in the

revival and regeneration of global economic recovery,” Verma said.

“The post sanctions regime, the BRICS is considering the implementation of an international reserve currency to facilitate global trade and partnerships in disruptions in the payment system. Settlements in national currencies can help in mitigating the challenges help in settlement will cater to participants of many countries. Enabling payments in national currencies between the BRICS partner countries can help tourism and health,” said Head of the group of South Asia and the Indian Ocean region of the Centre for Asia Pacific Studies, Alexey Kupriyanov.

Former Dean of School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University Anuradha Chenoy stressed on the need to address the challenges posed by the “selective de-globalisation” and the intended shift in global supply chains will lead to disruptions especially to the vulnerable countries.

## Tejashwi Yadav blames BJP for Maha pol crisis

**Patna:** RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav on Friday squarely blamed BJP’s “dictatorial” ambition of “hijacking” the entire country for the ongoing political crisis in Maharashtra.

Yadav said this when asked to comment on the happenings in the western state, where revolt in Shiv Sena threatens to pull down the government it heads with the help of Congress and NCP.

“It is well known that the BJP does not let any government opposed to it function in peace. It tries to topple such regimes by hook or by crook”, the former Bihar deputy chief minister alleged.

“BJP wants to hijack every state where it is not in power. It is an attitude of tanashahi (dictatorship)”, alleged Yadav who was stripped of power in 2017 when Chief Minister Nitish Kumar abruptly snapped ties with his RJD and returned to the NDA fold.

Yadav, who is now the leader of the opposition, however, declined to comment on whether he foresaw any political instability in Bihar where the saffron party and Kumar’s JD(U) appear at daggers drawn, specially in the aftermath of ‘Agnipath’ scheme which triggered violent protests across Bihar. **PTI**

## Prez poll: Shivpal, Azam Khan skip Akhilesh’s meeting

Samajwadi Party senior leader Mohammad Azam Khan and party MLA Shivpal Singh Yadav stayed away from the meeting called by party president Akhilesh Yadav to finalise the strategy for the presidential election.

The total value of votes of MLAs and MPs of SP and its allies is 26,000.

Members of Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha and MLAs of the State Assemblies constitute the electoral college of the presidential election. Each MP carries a vote value of 708, which is based on a pre-decided formula. The vote value of each MLA varies as per a State’s population (1971 Census) and the number of seats in assembly.

## SIT arrests four cops for teacher’s suicide in custody

The Special Investigation Team (SIT) probing the suicide by a teacher in Kannauj held four policemen, including the then inspector, responsible for pushing the man to end his life in police custody.

A 35-year-old Government school teacher, who was detained by police following a complaint by his in-laws, hanged himself inside a police station in Kannauj on March 20. The deceased teacher’s family alleged that he was tortured by his in-laws and later in police custody after which he committed suicide.

Parvat Singh of Jalaun district, an assistant teacher at a government school in Auraiya, visited his in-law’s place in Sukhapurwa village of Kannauj. There he allegedly created a ruckus following a conflict with his wife Neeraj.

On the basis of the complaint of Neeraj’s family, the teacher was detained by the police at night. Around 3 o’clock in the morning, Parvat Singh was found hanging in the toilet of the Kotwali. The father of the deceased had lodged a

report against three people, including daughter-in-law Neeraj. After the death of the teacher in police custody, the investigation was given to the Crime Branch, Crime Investigation Department (CBCID).

The CBCID lodged an FIR against the then Tirwa Kotwali in-charge Tribhuvan Kumar, head moharrir Radheshyam, the guard constable Arun Kumar and the then Sadar Kotwali in-charge Inspector Vikas Rai, who was investigating the matter and filed a final report without waiting for the medical report.

On the petition of the accused, a division bench of the Allahabad High Court had directed the state government to constitute an SIT and conduct a fair investigation into the case. The SIT found that Inspector Tribhuvan Singh had illegally detained the teacher, Parvat Singh, in the police station, and his medical report was not made after his death. Constable Arun Kumar, the SIT said, showed negligence by taking the deceased to the toilet due to which Parvat Singh got the chance to end his life.

## Shiv Sena workers vandalise board at rebel MLA’s office in Mumbai

**Mumbai:** Shiv Sena workers on Friday vandalized a board outside the office of party MLA Mangesh Kudalkar who is part of the group of rebel legislators led by senior Maharashtra minister Eknath Shinde, police said.

Kudalkar represents the Kurla assembly constituency in the city.

He is camping in Guwahati along with Shinde and other Sena MLAs who have rebelled against Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray.

A group of Shiv Sena supporters gathered outside Kudalkar’s office in Nehrunagar area of Kurla and tried to smash up a board bearing his name and photograph, said a police official.

Before they could attack the MLAs’ office, police personnel on the spot intervened, following which they dispersed, he added.

Mumbai police have stepped up security at several locations including Shiv Sena ‘shakhas’ (local offices) in the city to prevent any untoward incident following Shinde’s rebellion. **PTI**

# 4 killed in head-on truck, bus collision in Lakhimpur Kheri

Four people were killed in a head-on collision between a truck and a Roadways bus near village Bharehta on Pilibhit-Basti highway in Dhaurahra Kotwali area of Lakhimpur Kheri district on Friday morning.

More than 12 people were seriously injured in the accident. According to the police, two people died on the spot while two succumbed to their injuries in the hospital. All the injured were rushed to the community health centre in

Dhaurahra. Due to the critical condition of many of the injured, the doctor referred them to the district hospital.

In another mishap in Dhaurahra locality of Kheri, a private bus knocked down a couple riding a motorcycle on Kafra Dhakherwa road, killing the wife on the spot. The husband, who was seriously injured, was rushed to the community health centre at Ramya Behad and his condition was said to be critical.

Naseeruddin of Salempur Kon village adjacent to the city was going towards Dhaurahra with his wife

Khushnuma when a private bus on the way to Dhaurahra from Lakhimpur hit his motorcycle.

The bus driver fled after the accident. In another mishap which took place in the Narkhi police station area of Firozabad district, three motorcycle riders were killed late on Thursday evening. The three youths, one of who was celebrating his birthday on the day, were friends and were returning home from the city.

The victims were identified as Shivam of Surajpura village who was celebrating his birthday on Thursday, and his friends Akash and Gaurav.

# Time to exit BRICS?

## India's continuation in the grouping lends legitimacy to the regimes of Xi and Putin

Chinese President Xi Jinping's concern over "expanding" military ties is not the worry of a statesman who is committed to global peace and rules-based international order; it is the fear of a tyrant who is the lord and master of the world's most powerful and dangerous rogue State. Addressing the virtual annual BRICS Business Forum from Beijing, he denounced the US' alliance-building in Asia (read Quad) and the West's sweeping sanctions against Russia. "In the past century, humanity has gone through the scourge of two World Wars and the dark shadow of the Cold War. The tragedies of the past tell us that hegemony, group politics and bloc confrontation bring no peace or security; they only lead to wars and conflicts," Xi said at the event in which there were representatives and business groups from Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa. If there is one country that must learn from the tragedies of the past, it is China; it is also the country that needs to realise that hegemony, group politics and bloc confrontation bring no peace or security. Not just realise but also act on this realisation and stop propping up other rogue States like Pakistan and North Korea. But this will not happen because what Xi wants is hegemony not peace, confrontation not dialogue. Similarly, he uses the Ukraine crisis, which he calls a "wake-up call for all in the world", to rant against the expansion of "military alliances".

The BRICS meet not only allows the Chinese President to spread his lies but also gives an opportunity to Russian President Vladimir Putin to partially regain some respectability that he lost after he launched an unprovoked attack on Ukraine. In his video address, Putin said that his country was "redirecting" its trade flows to BRICS nations and other "reliable international partners". Unsurprisingly, he slammed the debilitating sanctions that the western nations had imposed on Russia, calling them "politically motivated" and "contrary to common sense and basic economic logic". The entire exercise of BRICS meet was galling from the Indian perspective, for Prime Minister Narendra Modi attended it. The head of the Government of the world's largest democracy sharing platform (though virtual) with the two most dangerous dictators was not something many Indians would cherish. In fact, the mere presence of the Indian Prime Minister lends a great deal of legitimacy and even respectability to the two tyrants; just like guilt by association, there is also legitimacy by association. Consider the contrast between India on the one hand and China and Russia on the other. In recent times, India has extended everything it could — PPE kits and vaccines to dozens of countries, aid to crisis-hit Sri Lanka. On the other hand, China exported the deadly virus that killed millions of people and Russia attacked a neighbour for no reason. Frankly, India should get out of BRICS which anyway lacks the *raison d'être*. Just like the Non-Aligned Movement.

## A BJP MLA's proclamation on 50 States after the LS poll must be for the right reasons

Stoking a political controversy, BJP's Karnataka leader Umesh Vishwanath Katti has stated that once PM Narendra Modi returns to power after the 2024 elections, the nation will have 50 States. He even elaborated the Union Government's purported plans to, at the local level, have North Karnataka as a separate State, and, at the national level, to split Maharashtra into three states and Uttar Pradesh into four. The six-term member of the Karnataka Legislative Assembly, who currently holds the portfolio in the Ministry of Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Department, is a vocal proponent of separate statehood for north Karnataka. A video of him making the statement, which took place at a Belagavi Bar Association event, has since gone viral. Ostensibly, the blueprint primarily takes into account the population numbers of bigger States; such States would be suitably bifurcated for the ease of governance and altogether 50 States would come into existence after the 2024 Lok Sabha election, as per the so-claimed initiative of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. It actually is high time that IT companies, who have Bengaluru their home, looked out outside the metropolis, especially since north Karnataka has huge potential.

Though Katti admitted that it's not his party's official stand, he exhorted the people of north Karnataka to "make it happen". He may have a point, though. Bengaluru is bursting at seams with its burgeoning population; it lacks water supply for citizens, who have to spend hours in traffic jams. The statements by Katti,

who represents the Hukkeri Assembly constituency, have reignited the regional divide debate in Karnataka in which most of the population and leaders from the northern parts of the State have been demanding statehood to get better amenities and development for the region. But this scheme by the ruling dispensation is quite understandable provided it's aimed squarely at providing better governance to the grassroots, bring development to the remotest regions and benefit the last man standing at the end of the spectrum. However, if the end aim is to reap narrow dividends for a particular party, the planned move can't be condoned. However, as we all know, there's a lot more to be read between the lines in politics than in their actual content, so there's only hoping that there's no mala fide intention behind the purported move.

# Agnipath scheme Govt's trial by fire

## The Govt faces an uphill task in meeting expectations of the nation's youth when economy is experiencing severe recession and job market is unstable

Much water has flown down the Ganges since unveiling of the new human resource policy by the Defence Ministry for recruiting soldiers, sailors and airmen. The country witnessed widespread protests, rioting and violence by youth in many States causing irreparable damage to public property. This abrupt change has not gone well with the youth aspiring to join the armed forces lured by the earlier system of joining service for 17 years and enjoying pension benefits. Taking note of the resentment among the youth and the Opposition encashing upon the unrest, the Government went into damage control and the age limit was enhanced from 21 years to 23 years. Home and Defence Ministries announced 10 per cent reservation to reinstate the retired troops in Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) forces, defence Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and other jobs. Some States also assured job security to Agniveers after their retirement. Indian business magnates justified the Agnipath scheme, claiming that it has large potential for employment.

Senior armed forces officers also sought to clear the doubts. Prime Minister Narendra Modi himself said that some reforms "may look unfair" at first, but will help in nation-building later. He met the three service chiefs to discuss the Agnipath scheme. The Army and the Air Force have since issued recruitment notifications. All these developments indicate that the Government failed to do proper homework before introducing the scheme and is now acting in haste to control the situation. The scheme has received mixed response from the veterans and public — those in service have supported the decision whereas most retired officers have criticised the move. They have raised apprehensions on various counts like the training duration for Agniveers, whether their motivation level will be as high as that of regular soldiers and the rehabilitation of retired troops. They have also criticised the hasty manner in which



the scheme was implemented without putting the scheme to test through a pilot project. To meet the cumulative threat from China and Pakistan, the Indian forces require young, highly trained and motivated soldiers. The pertinent questions are whether the new breed of Agniveers will be able to meet this challenge?

What benefits would the retired Agniveers get? How would the defence forces gain out of this scheme? Critics feel that the first casualty would be the quality of human resources. Any eligible person will first compete for jobs in civilian Government, police and Central forces where she enjoys assured service till the age of 60 years and pension benefits, before opting for the four-year unsecured stint in the armed forces. The second casualty would be training — an Agniveer's six-month stint will be able to gain him neither any worthwhile expertise in handling expensive military equipment nor understand the nuances of a modern battlefield of artificial intelligence, cyber warfare etc. Poor-quality human resources, inadequately trained and poorly paid Agniveers, lacking any motivation with a broken regi-

mental system, will be a disaster in the making for our armed forces.

The scheme's supporters hailed it as a path-breaking initiative that would replace an aging Army, in which more than 60 per cent men are above 30 years of age and would pave the way for regular intake and availability of young, fit and motivated youth who wish to don the uniform and serve the nation for short periods. The scheme is expected to open up new opportunities for our youth, boost civil-military fusion and pave the way for becoming worthy representatives of the best regimental traditions of the armed forces. One of the biggest challenges facing the armed forces is the budgetary constraints. Ballooning salary and pension bills have placed enormous stress on the availability of funds for military modernisation. The emphasis of the new scheme is on ensuring a youthful and tech-savvy profile of the armed forces while reducing the overall burden on pension and gratuities. Another logic given in favour of this scheme is that several foreign models were studied before its implementation. The service period ranges from two to eight

years with options for active and reservist service in many modern armed forces of the world, such as the US, UK and France. The Israeli army, which is considered to be one of the best in the world, has service of 30 and 20 months, respectively, for men and women.

The Government faces an uphill task of tackling this peculiar situation of meeting expectations of the frustrated youth at a time when the economy is experiencing severe recession and job market is unstable. Unfortunately, the 1.4 million-strong Army has faced neglect by all Governments, defence expenditure being relegated to the "non-plan" category and Finance Ministry, instead of finding ways and means of raising essential, additional funds for national defence, has passed the buck to the armed forces and demanded that they evolve measures for reducing the pension bill. All these lacunae need to be taken care of before it is too late.

### OUR SOLDIERS LEARNING MANDARIN

Sir — At a time when modern communication techniques are transforming the landscape of military warfare, the prospects of countries are likely to depend on how soldiers conduct themselves when they face their enemy soldiers at an unarmed border. In this respect, basic conversation in enemy language is of utmost importance. The Government's initiative to train them in the Chinese language is aimed at easing tensions emanating from a lack of proper language communication between the border patrols. CUSTOMS DUTY IS MUST ON E-TRANSMISSIONS

It will provide a level playing field to the domestic industry

Moratorium on customs duties on electronic transmissions has got another lease of life at the World Trade Organisation's 12th Ministerial Conference (MC12). Some say this has happened due to pressure exerted by the United States, others think that India has bargained this for other gains.

It's noteworthy that India had pronounced that it would oppose this moratorium, as it causes a huge loss of revenue, apart from hurting our digital development, as domestic players face intense competition from global tech companies.

Significantly, at the time of the start of the WTO, trade in electronic products was very limited. In such a situation, the tariff on the trade of electronic products was temporarily suspended and it was decided in the Second Ministerial Conference of the WTO in 1998 to study the issues related to the global electronic trade with reference to the development needs of the developing countries. It was proposed that tariffs on electronic products be postponed till the next ministerial conference.

It is unfortunate that the developed countries kept suspending the decision on imposing tariffs on the import of electronic products, on several pretexts. Today the situation is that more than \$30 billion of electronic products are being imported into India alone. That is, even if 10 per cent tariff is imposed, the government will get revenue of more than \$3 billion.



According to a recent study, developing countries could have generated \$56 billion from imports of just 49 digitalised products in the period 2017-19. Least developed countries could have generated \$8 billion in this period, which is double the amount they need for giving double dose of Covid vaccine to their populations.

The issue here is not only about loss of revenue, it's a much larger issue for a country like India, where our start-ups and software companies are able to make a variety of electronic products, where we can make movies and other entertainment products in our own country, but when all such products are imported undeterred, without tariff, there is little incentive to produce them indigenously.

Tariff moratorium on e-products is actually killing our efforts of Atmanirbhar Bharat, benefitting the US, European countries, and China.

At the beginning of MC12, India started with a bold stance and Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal said: "I think this moratorium, which has been continuing for 24 years, must be reviewed and re-looked at."

However, the decision on moratorium in MC12, is read as follows: "We agree to maintain the current practice of not imposing customs duties on electronic transmissions until MC 13, which should ordinarily be held by 31 December 2023. Should MC 13 be delayed beyond 31 March 2024, the moratorium will expire on the date unless Ministers or the General Council take a decision to extend."

In the earlier Ministerial Conferences of WTO, in the last 24 years, the developed world had been easily getting the moratorium. MC12, was the first such conference where they faced some resistance from the developing countries. With this, a hope had arisen that the moratorium would end ultimately. But this battle was also lost.

Since 1998, the digital revolution has changed a lot in the world. There are digital products which are fast replacing physical products. Many of the digital products in health, fintech, public services, etc., incorporate artificial intelligence and 3D printing. Failure to tax them in innovative ways is likely to impact the government finances adversely.

We have started developing our own digital products; the production linked incentives (PLIs) scheme has been designed to nurture our infant digital products industries. Imposition of custom duties can help them by providing a level-playing field.

Though MC12 is over, India should leave no stone unturned to end this moratorium.

Despite its low share price, LIC is valuable

The IPO was a failure but LIC policyholders and investors will get their money's worth in course of time

The insurance industry is now at a crossroads. The regulator is busy changing the rules of the game. Insurers are changing business models, disrupting the traditional value chain. Foreign insurers and reinsurers are taking more interest in the business, as the insurance market is growing, following the rising prosperity of people despite a recessionary situation. Yet, insurers are still at their wits' end as to how to take insurance penetration to the next level.

Amidst this scenario, LIC launched its IPO by offering 3.5 per cent of its shares to retail and institutional investors. This has enabled the government to mop up about Rs 21,000 crore from the market. As much as 10 per cent of the offloaded LIC shares have been allotted to policyholders and 5 per cent to employees. In fact, this was the biggest IPO in India's corporate history.

About a month has elapsed since the listing of LIC's shares in stock exchanges. At the moment, LIC shares are traded about 30 per cent below the issue price. Some doomsayer analysts have already started fear-mongering in the market, proclaiming this as a bad omen for the market leader. In this article, I would try to dispel this notion.

Certain facts merit special attention of those who have invested money in LIC's IPO. This article is all about instilling confidence in LIC policyholders and shareholders by reassuring that they will get their money's worth in the days to come.

Let us see how LIC is placed in the market vis-à-vis its competitors. It has customers all over the country and across all sections of society. It has 30 crore in-force policies in its books as on date. On the other hand, none of the private insurers has a strong presence in rural India, as most of them are engaged in picking up low-hanging fruits of the metro and Tier-I cities. None of the private life insurers has even 1 crore of in-force policies. Most Indians living outside metros and Tier-I cities have not even heard the names of leading private insurers. For them, life insurance means LIC.

Besides, LIC is insuring the lives of crores of poorer citizens through low-cost group insurance schemes. Some financial analysts go to the extent of saying that LIC's products are not innovative enough. The fact is all insurers have innovative products. It is more important to check whether the insurers are able to sell those products in the market. Even on this count, LIC is much ahead of the competition. LIC sells all types of insurance products in large numbers—endowment, term, whole life, or even annuities. On the other hand, private insurers as a whole earn 40 per cent of the premium income by selling Ulips only.

While Ulips are not necessarily unde-

sirable products, they are more investment-oriented than insurance. Indians need more protection, savings, and annuity products than investment products with some element of insurance. And LIC has been selling more protection/savings products, to take the benefits of insurance to the remotest corners of the country.

Let's talk a little bit about the technicality of this business. Embedded value (EV) is defined as the present value of future profits plus adjusted net asset value. EV of LIC was calculated to be Rs 5.4 lakh crore before the launch of IPO. This was arrived at, on the basis of realistic assumptions on future mortality, expenses and interest rates. Insurers and their consultants made pretty conservative assumptions on these parameters. All these bases of valuation are, however, more or less the same for all the insurers (except to some extent the expenses).

What then can make the difference? I would say persistency ratios of insurers (especially 61-month persistency) can determine EV of the insurers a lot. For LIC, this ratio is 48 per cent in terms of policies (the industry average being 33 per cent and 59 per cent in terms of premiums). This is very close to the global standard. A satisfactory persistency ratio of LIC means there will be a satisfactory flow of premium income in future, resulting in better surpluses. If there are better surpluses, there will be higher dividends and also higher share price.

Nobody can belittle the contribution of private insurers. But people need to know certain facts

which prove LIC's dominance in the industry across the country. LIC is respected not just for its holding 66 per cent market share but also for its omnipresence in the country, making it convenient for ordinary people to visit the insurer's offices. The hallmark of its operations is the honesty and integrity with which the employees have been discharging their duties and clean image that the organisation has been able to maintain in the midst of corporations getting entangled in recurring financial scams. LIC is one organisation which has worked from their brick-and-mortar offices even during the worst of pandemic times, keeping the interests of crores of its customers and one million plus intermediaries in sight.

Now, let's talk about the movement of share price of LIC. As have already been mentioned, only 10 per cent shares have been sold to policyholders and 5 per cent to employees. A bulk was sold to anchor investors. Hence, the people reposing faith in LIC as policyholders and the people investing in IPO are completely different.

A section of investors is being made to believe that the IPO was overpriced and that the price would slide even further as the fundamentals of the organisation were below par. They were also fed on the rumour that anchor investors would offload their shares immediately after lock-in period. All such negative publicity contributed to the fall in share price so rapidly. But there is a limit to such fall as regards the share price of an organisation as financially sound as LIC.

Let's remember some basics of the investment game. Once Warren Buffet said, "In the short run, stocks behave like a slot machine, but in the long run, they behave like a weighing machine." Now the share price of LIC is moving randomly and is getting determined purely by forces of demand and supply. These random movements cannot be used to predict the long-term value of the stock.

In the long run, the intrinsic value of a company remains constant, irrespective of what the traders of stocks do every day in the market. In the long run, the share price will be equal to the intrinsic value of a company. This is true for all the markets and for all the stocks. The annual report of LIC is in the public domain and investors can access that. All successful investors of the world muster the skill of making sense out of financial and industry data, and wait patiently for the fair value of a company to emerge.

Every Indian knows what LIC stands for. The organisation has weathered many storms in its 66-year journey since 1956. Yes, there is a need for the business model of the organisation to undergo change; it is already working towards that.

Finally, we must remember that not all analysts are in the business of misguiding investors. JP Morgan said in its recently released report on LIC that the market failed to understand the strength of LIC. The price to embedded value ratio (P/EV) is unrealistically low. This means that both the LIC policyholders and investors will get their money's worth in course of time.

US-Pakistan partnership: Always at India's cost

Pakistan, which played an important role in containing the spread of communism, continues to be of help to the US

US State Department spokesperson Ned Price recently commented in favour of advancing the "US-Pakistan partnership" in a manner that serves their "mutual interests." Elsewhere, at the CNN News18 Town Hall, S. Jaishankar stated that a "lot of India's problems with Pakistan are directly attributable to the support that the United States gave to Pakistan." The link between the US support to Pakistan and India's problems needs to be revisited.

Theoretically, the power of the weak states to attract the great powers has been well established. Weak states cannot defend themselves. Consequently, they seek financial and military aid in exchange for their strategic autonomy and the geostrategic location. Pakistan is

one such state.

Soviet Union leader Stalin first extended an invitation to Pakistan PM Liaquat Ali Khan in 1949 to visit Moscow. The fundamental differences between an Islamist state and a communist Soviet prevented that entente; hence, Pakistan sided with the US and played an important role in containing the spread of communism.

By 1955, Pakistan had joined two regional defence pacts, the South East Asia Treaty Organization and the Central Treaty Organization (Baghdad Pact). A little before 1955, in 1953, when Ayub Khan visited Turkey, he reiterated Dulles's 'northern tier defence pact' in which the two countries would occupy a prominent position. Later in 1954, the Turko-Iraqi agreement (Baghdad Pact)

superseded the Turko-Pak plan.

Consequently, from 1953 to 1961, Islamabad received nearly \$2 billion in US assistance, one-quarter of this in military aid. Apart from this data, information retrieved from the Stockholm Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) indicates that from 1955 to 1959, US arms exports amounted to \$1.02 billion. When correlated with Pakistan's then financial situation, strong indications of a vicious cycle of US aid and US arms exports emerge. In the budding relationship between the two, the core security concerns of India, a democratic nonaligned country, were sidelined.

Upon India's vehement protests, oral assurances were given by Eisenhower to Nehru that the US would take care of

the situation in a case of Pakistan's aggression against India. Thus, while India was idealistically following a nonaligned policy, Pakistan was hard bargaining its geostrategic location in lieu of military aid. According to the strategic experts, nearly four-fifths of all the foreign aid Pakistan received during 1951-60 came from the US. From the 1960s to the late 1970s, there was a brief period when US aid to Pakistan decreased.

The 1979 Soviet invasion of Afghanistan again allowed Pakistan to extract more aid from the US. In exchange for Pakistan's role in the Afghan war, a \$400-million US aid was offered to Pakistan. It was rejected by the Zia-ul-Haq regime in 1980 and was labeled as 'peanuts.' Haq eyed the F-16,

which Islamabad later got.

Thus, from 1983 to 1990, Pakistan received military aid of \$3.73 billion along with 1,000 Stinger missiles, and the component of US arms sales was \$2.2 billion. This was the same period when Pakistan's proxy war in Kashmir started, including the massacre of Kashmiri Hindus.

Also, at a regional level, many security experts attribute the birth of the Taliban to ISI and US agencies. Had the US assistance not been there, Pakistan would not have been so aggressive against India and its other neighbours, such as Afghanistan and Iran. Thus, the relationship between Pakistan and the US has always been based on a patron-client state wherein foreign or military aid is given to serve the US' geopolitical interests.

In the post-Cold War phase,

Pakistan was reeling under sanctions due to its nuclear tests and was denied any military aid. However, the 9/11 attacks in the US again brought Pakistan to the forefront of Washington's South Asia policy. As per the SIPRI data, during 2002-14 Pakistan, as a major non-NATO ally, got military aid worth \$5.81 billion and the arms sales component was \$3.2 billion.

This was the same period when the Nandimarg massacre and Mumbai attacks took place. All these attacks were attributed to Pakistan. India collected the 'proof' and gave it to the US, hoping that the US might acknowledge it and help India. Little did India realise that the geopolitics of national interests, military aid, and arms trade are closely interrelated factors. Hence Pakistan was never

labeled as a 'terrorist state' by the US.

It was only after Pakistan's backstabbing of the US in Afghanistan that former US president Donald Trump realised America's mistake and commented in 2018 that it had "foolishly" given aid and, in return, merely got "lies and deceit."

Today, despite Washington's zero-tolerance policy against terrorism and the backstabbing by Pakistan in Afghanistan, the US is all set to re-engage Pakistan, which will harm India's interests.

Given the evolving situation, India too is changing. The coupling of strategic autonomy and Atmanirbhar Bharat in the defence sector is the answer to the geopolitics of the patron-client relationship.



# UKRAINIAN ARMY TO LEAVE BATTERED CITY TO AVOID ENCIRCLEMENT

After weeks of ferocious fighting, Ukrainian forces will retreat from a besieged city in the country's east to avoid encirclement, a regional governor said Friday.

The city of Sievierodonetsk, the administrative center of the Luhansk region, has faced relentless Russian bombardment. Ukrainian troops fought the Russians in house-to-house battles before retreating to a huge chemical factory on the city's edge, where they holed up in its sprawling underground structures.

In recent days, Russian forces have made gains around Sievierodonetsk and the neighboring city of Lysychansk, on a steep bank across the river, in a bid to encircle Ukrainian forces.

Luhansk Gov. Serhiy Haidai said that the Ukrainian troops have been given the order to leave Sievierodonetsk to prevent that.

"Regrettably, we will have to pull our troops out of Sievierodonetsk," Haidai told The Associated Press. "It makes no sense to stay at the destroyed positions, and the number of killed in action has been growing."

He said that the Ukrainian soldiers have "received the order to retreat from Sievierodonetsk to new positions in fortified areas and continue resistance from there."

Haidai noted that Ukrainian troops still remain in Sievierodonetsk, facing massive Russian bombardment that has destroyed 80% of buildings.

Haidai said the Russians were also advancing toward Lysychansk from

Zolote and Toshkivka, adding that Russian reconnaissance units conducted forays on the city edges but were driven out by its defenders.

The governor added that a bridge

on a highway leading to Lysychansk was badly damaged in a Russian airstrike and became unusable for trucks.

The Russian Defense Ministry declared Friday that four Ukrainian bat-

talions and a unit of "foreign mercenaries" totaling about 2,000 soldiers have been "fully blocked" near Hirske and Zolote, south of Lysychansk. The claim couldn't be independently verified.

Following a botched attempt to capture Kyiv, Ukraine's capital, in the early stage of the invasion that started Feb. 24, Russian forces have shifted focus in the war to the Donbas region, where the Ukrainian forces have fought Moscow-backed separatists since 2014.

The Russian military controls about 95% of Luhansk province and about half of neighboring Donetsk province, the two areas that make up the Donbas.

After repeated requests to its Western allies for heavier weaponry to counter Russia's edge in firepower, Ukrainian Defense Minister Oleksii Reznikov said a response had arrived in the form of medium-range American rocket launchers.

A U.S. defense official confirmed Wednesday that all four of the promised High Mobility Artillery Rocket Systems, or HIMARS, were in the hands of Ukrainian forces but said it wasn't clear if they have been used yet.

The U.S. approved providing the precision-guided systems at the end of May, and once they were in the region, Ukraine's forces needed about three weeks of training to operate them. The rockets can travel about 45 miles (70 kilometers).

The U.S. will send an addition \$450 million in military aid to Ukraine, including four more of the medium-range rocket systems, ammunition and other supplies, U.S. officials announced Thursday.



## Ukrainians cheer nation's EU candidacy amid wartime woes

The European Union's decision to make Ukraine a candidate for EU membership offered war-weary Ukrainians a morale boost and hope of a more secure future Friday as the country's military ordered its fighters to retreat from a key city in the eastern Donbas region.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy hailed the decision for EU leaders as vindication for his nation's fight against Russia's aggression and said he was determined to ensure Ukraine retained the ability to decide if belonged in Europe or under Moscow's influence. "This war began just when Ukraine declared its right to freedom. To its choice of its future. We saw it in the European Union," Zelenskyy told the nation in a televised address late Thursday.

"That is why this decision of the EU is so important, motivates us and shows all this is needed not only by us."

Others recalled the 2014 revolution that ousted

Ukraine's pro-Moscow president, sparked in part by his decision not to complete an association agreement with the EU. Russian President Vladimir Putin opposed that agreement, just as he demanded before he sent troops into Ukraine on Feb. 24 that NATO never accept Ukraine as an alliance member.

Arseniy Yatsenyuk, an opposition leader who became prime minister after the revolution, expressed joy at the country's candidate status but also "bitterness" over the "terrible price that Ukraine pays for the desire to be a free, independent European state."

"Thank you to our soldiers - they won this decision," Yatsenyuk tweeted. "Ukraine is a great country that will inevitably become a member of the EU and, just as inevitably, a member of NATO."

Ukraine applied for membership less than a week after Russia invaded the country and must undergo a complicated process of many months to be eligible to join the 27-nation bloc.

## Poland gets a loan to help it look after Ukraine refugees

Poland is getting a loan of 450 million euros (\$474 million) from a bank linked to a European human rights group to help it cope with the influx of refugees fleeing Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Poland and the Council of Europe Development Bank signed the loan agreement Friday.

Some 4.3 million refugees crossed into Poland after Russia invaded Ukraine in February. Poland is providing them with free shelter, social and medical care, education and job opportunities.

Many have moved on to other countries and some have decided to go back home, but an estimated half of the number remain in Poland.

Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki singled out the European Union earlier this month, saying it's decision-making procedures for providing financial support are "sometimes too slow."

The Council of Europe has 46 member countries, including EU nations, and aims to protect human rights, democracy and the rule of law.

## Russian military cargo plane crashes, killing 4

A Russian military cargo plane crashed Friday, killing at least four crewmembers and leaving several others injured, officials said.

The heavylift Il-76 cargo plane went down in the southwestern Ryazan region. The Russian Defense Ministry said that the plane suffered an engine problem that forced the crew to crash-land it on the ground.

The regional administration said that four of its crew were killed and a further five were injured when the plane slammed into a field just outside the city of Ryazan. Officials said that those injured were hospitalised in grave condition.

The four-engine Il-76 was designed in the 1970s and has served as the main heavylift cargo plane for the Soviet and Russian air force. It has also been widely used by many countries around the world.

## UN chief warns of 'catastrophe' from global food shortage

The head of the United Nations warned Friday that the world faces "catastrophe" because of the growing shortage of food around the globe.

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said the war in Ukraine has added to the disruptions caused by climate change, the coronavirus pandemic and inequality to produce an "unprecedented global hunger crisis" already affecting hundreds of millions of people.

"There is a real risk that multiple famines will be declared in 2022," he said in a video message to officials from dozens of rich and developing countries gathered in Berlin. "And 2023 could be even worse."

Guterres noted that harvests across Asia, Africa and the Americas will take a hit as farmers around the world struggle to cope with rising fertilizer and energy prices.

"This year's food access issues could become next year's global food shortage," he said.



"No country will be immune to the social and economic repercussions of such a catastrophe."

Guterres said UN Negotiators were working on a deal that would enable Ukraine to export food, including via the Black Sea, and let Russia bring food and fertilizer to world markets without restrictions.

He also called for debt relief for poor countries to help keep their economies afloat and for the private sector to help sta-

bilise global food markets.

The Berlin meeting's host, German Foreign Minister Annalena Baerbock, said Moscow's claim that Western sanctions imposed over Russia's invasion of Ukraine were to blame for food shortages was "completely untenable."

Russia exported as much wheat in May and June this year as in the same months of 2021, Baerbock said.


She echoed Guterres' comments that several factors underlie the growing hunger crisis around the world.

"But it was Russia's war of attack against Ukraine that turned a wave into a tsunami," Baerbock said.

U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken insisted that Russia has no excuse for holding back vital goods from world markets.

"The sanctions that we've imposed on Russia collectively and with many other countries exempt food, exempt food products, exempt fertilizers, exempt insurers, exempt shippers," he said.

# Monetary policy actions to be more moderate than other nations: RBI

**New Delhi:** RBI Deputy Governor Michael Debabrata Patra on Friday exuded confidence that the monetary policy actions will be more moderate than the rest of the world, as inflation is expected to fall below 6 per cent in the January-March quarter of the current fiscal.

The Reserve Bank has already raised the key policy rate by 90 basis points in May and June to 4.9 per cent to tame high inflation, mainly due to supply disruptions on account of the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war.

Speaking at a session on 'Geo-Political Spill-overs and Indian Economy' at PHDCCI here, Patra said there are indications that inflation may be peaking.

"As monetary policy works through into the economy...Inflation is expected to fall back into the threshold in the fourth quarter of 2022-23 and fall even further in the next year. This is only the baseline scenario," he said, adding that because of initiatives taken so far, the inflation may fall "sooner and faster".

"Therefore, in this world of global inflation crisis, it is possibly better to look at the change in inflation, not the level," said the Deputy Governor, who looks after the monetary policy department in

the RBI.

He is also a member of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), which decides the key policy rate (repo).

The government has tasked the RBI to ensure inflation remains at 4 per cent with a two per cent deviation on either side.

While the retail inflation based on Consumer Price Index (CPI) moderated to 7.04 per cent in May from 7.8 per cent in April, it remained above the RBI's threshold of 6 per cent for the fifth month in a row. "Against this backdrop, it is our hope that required monetary policy actions in India will be more moderate than elsewhere in the world and that we will be able to bring inflation back to target within a two-year time

span.

If the monsoon brings with it a more benign outlook on food prices, India would have tamed the inflation crisis even earlier," he said.

Observing that the decline in inflation will be very "grudging", Patra said India will "succeed in bending down the future trajectory of inflation and thereby it will win the war".

Earlier this month, the Reserve Bank in its bi-monthly monetary policy review raised the benchmark repo rate -- at which it lends short-term money to banks -- by a sharp 0.50 per cent to 4.90 per cent to rein in spiralling prices. It followed an off-cycle meeting on May 4, when the central bank hiked the repo rate by 0.40 per cent. **PTI**

## RBI exploring options to ensure customer safety dealing with PPIs issued by non-bank entities

**New Delhi:** The Reserve Bank is considering various options to ensure that customers are not put at risk on account of activities of non-bank fintech players with regard to prepaid payment instruments (PPIs), sources said.

Earlier this week, RBI issued an advisory clarifying that non-bank prepaid payment instrument (PPI) issuers cannot load their wallets and cards from credit lines or pre-set borrowing limits.

Such practice, if followed, should be stopped immediately and any non-compliance will attract penal action, the advisory said.

According to sources, the idea behind the issuance of the advisory was to ensure customer safety and also to stress the fact that any business that requires an authorization or a licence should not be done by someone else without authorization or licence.

The RBI is in discussion with the players and exploring options to deal with the situation, sources said. Innovation should not be based on regulatory arbitrage so various options are being explored including devising a framework and greater disclosure for non-bank fintech players issuing prepaid payment instruments (PPIs) and Buy Now Pay Later (BNPL) players, sources said.

PPIs are instruments that facilitate purchase of goods and services, financial services, and remittance facilities, against the value stored therein. **PTI**

# Sensex, Nifty gain for 2nd day amid firm global trends

## Close up nearly 1%

**Mumbai:** Benchmark Sensex and Nifty rose by nearly 1 per cent on Friday, extending gains for a second straight day on the back of buying in auto, banking, and energy stocks in line with firm global trends.

The 30-share BSE Sensex advanced further by 462.26 points or 0.88 per cent to settle at 52,727.98 as 23 of its constituents ended in the green. During the day, it rallied 644.15 points or 1.23 per cent to 52,909.87.

The Nifty rose by 142.60 points or 0.92 per cent to settle at 15,699.25 with 39 of its scrips posting gains. Sensex and Nifty had recovered nearly 1 per cent Thursday.

"Mirroring a firm trend in the global market and in response to declining commodity prices, the domestic market maintained its positive trend.

The up-move was supported by broad-based buying except in IT," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services.

From the Sensex pack, M&M was the biggest gainer spurting 4.28 per cent. IndusInd Bank rose by 2.59 per cent, Bajaj Finance by 2.58 per cent, Hindustan Unilever by 2.3



per cent, ICICI Bank by 2 per cent, and Bharti Airtel by 1.72 per cent.

Index heavyweight Reliance Industries rebounded 1.47 per cent and Tata Steel by 1.42 per cent. Nestle, HDFC Bank, HDFC, Ultratech Cement, Maruti, Kotak Bank, Axis Bank and SBI also advanced.

On the other hand, Tech Mahindra, Infosys, HCL Technologies, TCS, Wipro and Sun Pharma were the laggards.

"Markets edged higher for the second consecutive session, driven by firm global cues. Healthy rebound financials, metals and PSU banks aided sentiments," Ajit Mishra, VP - Research, Religare Broking Ltd, said.

The broader markets outperformed and ended higher in

the range of 1.4 per cent to 1.6 per cent. Barring IT, all the other sectoral indices ended in the green.

The BSE smallcap gauge jumped 1.60 per cent and the midcap index gained 1.53 per cent.

Among the BSE sectoral indices, telecom jumped 2.53 per cent, auto (1.98 per cent) power (1.73 per cent), consumer discretionary goods & services (1.68 per cent), consumer durables (1.47 per cent) and finance (1.40 per cent). Information Technology and tech were the only laggards.

As many as 2,401 stocks advanced, while 906 declined and 141 remained unchanged.

On weekly basis, Sensex jumped 2.66 per cent or 1,367 points after two straight weeks of losses. **PTI**

# Rupee settles at all-time low of 78.33 against US dollar

**Mumbai:** The rupee on Friday slipped 1 paisa to close at its all-time low of 78.33 (provisional) against the US dollar.

At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local currency opened at 78.20 and finally settled at its all-time low of 78.33, down 1 paisa from its previous close.

During the day, the local unit witnessed an intra-day high of 78.19 and a low of 78.35 against the American currency. On Thursday, the rupee had settled at 78.32 against the US dollar. The dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, fell 0.25 per cent to 104.17. Brent crude futures, the global oil benchmark, advanced 1.13 per cent to USD 111.29 per barrel.

On the domestic equity market front, the BSE Sensex ended 462.26 points or 0.88 per



cent higher at 52,727.98, while the broader NSE Nifty gained 142.60 points or 0.92 per cent to 15,699.25.

Foreign institutional investors remained net sellers in the capital market on Thursday as they offloaded shares worth Rs 2,319.06 crore, as per stock exchange data.

Meanwhile, Reserve Bank Deputy Governor Michael D Patra on Friday said the Central Bank will not allow "jerky movements" of the rupee and stressed that the Indian currency has witnessed the least depreciation in recent times. **PTI**

**New Delhi:** Gold prices declined by ₹70 to ₹50,557 per 10 grams in the national capital on Friday, according to HDFC securities.

In the previous trade, the precious metal settled at ₹50,627 per 10 grams.

Silver prices also declined by ₹621 to ₹59,077 per kg from ₹59,698 per kg in the previous trade.

"Spot gold prices for 24-carat gold in Delhi fell by ₹70 reflecting overnight fall in COMEX gold prices," said Tapan Patel, Senior Analyst (Commodities) at HDFC Securities. In the international market, gold was trading higher at USD 1,828 per ounce and silver was flat at USD 20.97 per ounce. Spot gold prices were up 0.33 per cent at COMEX, Patel added. **PTI**

# Centre procures 52,460 tonne onion till May for buffer stock

**New Delhi:** The Centre has procured 52,460 tonne of onion till May-end this year for maintaining a buffer stock, a senior Consumer Affairs Ministry official said on Friday.

The Government for the last few years has been maintaining a buffer stock of onion to tackle price rise during the lean season. Onion is being procured through an agency National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India (Nafed).

A procurement target of 2.50 lakh tonne of rabi 2022 onion has been fixed for 2022-23. "Nafed has reportedly procured 52,460.34 tonne of onion till May 31, this year," the official said.

The target set for the current year will be achieved by next month, the official added.

In 2021-22, a total quantity of 2.08 lakh tonne of rabi (winter) onion was procured for calibrated and targeted releases to stabilise prices dur-



ing the lean season.

As per the Agriculture Ministry's estimate, the country's total onion production is estimated to increase by 16.81

per cent to 31.12 million tonne in the 2022-23 crop year (July-June), compared to 26.64 million tonne in the 2021-22 crop year. **PTI**

# GST dept may soon clarify on exemptions to IVF, tax on honorarium paid to guest anchors

**New Delhi:** The GST department may soon issue a host of clarification on certain vexed issues in tax rates, including exemptions to assisted reproductive technology (ART) or in vitro fertilization (IVF) as well as applicability of GST on payment of honorarium to guest anchors.

A committee of tax officers from the Centre and states, referred to as the Fitment Committee, has informed the GST Council that healthcare services provided by a clinical establishment, an authorised medical practitioner or paramedics are exempt under Goods and Services Tax regime and a clarification be issued regarding GST exemptions to ART/IVFs.

GST law defines health-



care services as any service by way of diagnosis or treatment or care for illness, injury, deformity, abnormality or pregnancy in any recognised system of medicines in India.

It also includes services by way of transportation of the patient to and from a clinical establishment, but does not include hair transplant or cosmetic or plastic surgery, except

when undertaken to restore or to reconstruct anatomy or functions of body affected due to congenital defects, developmental abnormalities, injury or trauma.

The ailment of infertility is treated using ART procedure such as IVF. Such services are covered under the definition of healthcare services for the purpose of above exemption notification, the fitment committee said adding a clarification may accordingly be issued by way of a circular.

The recommendations of the committee which will be placed before the GST Council meeting on June 28-29 also include a clarification on the issue of applicability of GST on payment of honorarium to the guest anchors. **PTI**

## Automobiles to be accorded 'Star Ratings' based on performance in crash tests: Gadkari

**New Delhi:** To boost road safety in India, Union Minister Nitin Gadkari on Friday said the new car assessment program -- Bharat NCAP, proposes a mechanism wherein automobiles in India shall be accorded 'Star Ratings' based upon their performance in crash tests.

In a series of tweets, Gadkari said the Bharat New Car Assessment Programme (Bharat NCAP) will serve as a consumer-centric platform, allowing customers to opt for cars based upon their Star-Ratings, while promoting competition among manufacturers (OEMs) in India to manufacture safer vehicles.

"I have now approved the draft GSR notification to introduce Bharat NCAP (New Car Assessment Program), wherein automobiles in India shall be accorded Star Ratings based upon their performance in crash tests," he said. **PTI**

# Govt re-advertises top post of oil regulator

**New Delhi:** The government has for a second time in as many years re-advertised the post of chairman of oil and gas regulator PNGRB, which has been lying vacant since December 2020.

The oil ministry this week issued an advertisement inviting applications for the post of chairman of the Petroleum and Natural Gas Regulatory Board (PNGRB).

It sought applications by July 21 from those who fulfill the qualifications and are not more than 62 years of age,

according to the advertisement.

The post of chairman of PNGRB has been lying vacant since December 4, 2020, when Dinesh K Sarraf completed his three-year term.

A search-cum-selection committee headed by V K Saraswat, Member (S&T), Niti Aayog in June 2021 picked former power secretary Sanjeev Nandan Sahai for the job. But that appointment was not confirmed by the government and so the post was re-advertised in November 2021. **PTI**

# India can finish on podium in hockey WC: Savita

India captain Savita feels there is no dearth of motivation and confidence in the national women's hockey team as it eyes a historic podium finish at the upcoming World Cup.

The top International Hockey Federation (FIH) tournament will be jointly hosted by the Netherlands and Spain from July 1 to 17.

India finished a historic fourth at the Olympics last year and Savita said the Tokyo Games had instilled a belief that they can match the best in the business on the biggest stage.

"Our performance in Tokyo gave us the belief that we can finish on the podium in global events," Savita said.

"Post Olympics, we realigned our focus on taking our performance to the next level. We channelled our energy into doing well in the FIH Pro League and finishing third in this prestigious league has given us a boost ahead of the World Cup."

Indian women's best-ever result at the World Cup is a fourth place finish in the inaugural edition in 1974. In the 2018 tournament, India secured the eighth spot.

India's splendid show in Tokyo has changed the face of women's hockey in the coun-



try. Featuring in its debut FIH Pro League, the Indian women gave big shots like the Netherlands and Argentina tough fights to finish a creditable third.

"The Indian women's hockey team has never won a medal at the World Cup and it is our mission to make this dream come alive this time," Savita said.

The ace goalkeeper said playing and fighting together as a unit will be key to success in the World Cup.

"We are very excited to play in the World Cup. We just want to play as a team. For us, the Olympics was a great experience. We learnt a lot from there and we believe we have to play together and fight hard," she said.

"After the Olympics, everyone in our team is so motivated, so focused. We really want to play against good teams," she added.

In the upcoming quadrennial event, India are placed in Pool B alongside England, China and New Zealand, and will open their campaign against England on July 3 at Amstelveen.

"Of course, England, China and New Zealand are good teams. We've already played against them. But we have to focus on ourselves first. We will go match by match," Savita said.

## Consistency is paramount for progress: Schopman ahead of WC

Indian women's hockey team coach Janneke Schopman is stressing on consistency, without which, she said on Friday, the side will struggle to go far in the upcoming World Cup.

The quadrennial event will be jointly hosted by the Netherlands and Spain from July 1 to 17.

India's best-ever result at the World Cup is a fourth-place finish in the inaugural edition in 1974. In 2018, India finished eighth.

"If we truly play to our potential, we play the way we know we can consistently, anything is possible. Women hockey at this moment is very tight, anyone can beat anyone," Schopman said.

"(But) consistency is a big point of attention. If we can play consistently well, top-4, and who knows a podium in the World Cup is a possibility."

"At the same time if we don't perform we can miss the quarterfinals."

The coach said the players need to understand their



potential and deliver on the field in order to achieve consistency.

"I think we have great potential and if we actually play to our potential we are a tough team to beat," the 45-year-old said.

Schopman, a double Olympic medalist defender from the Netherlands, said players will have to shoulder responsibility to achieve success in the World Cup.

"If anything I need to see is players taking up ownership on the field and believe that they can perform."

"Realistically, I think we are up there. We are in the top 6. Our performance against Argentina (recently in Pro League) showed that we can compete against any country."

India finished a creditable third in their debut FIH Pro League season and Schopman said the recent back-to-back high-intensity matches against Belgium and Argentina augur well ahead of the World Cup.

"Pretty happy with our preparation. We have another week. Last week we had the Pro League matches and quite happy with the way we responded after the Belgium matches. So preparation is going in the right direction."

"It's a great achievement to finish on the podium in your first Pro League. We had good runs against pretty much every team we played. Apart from points we got we learned a lot from these games. It was a satisfying run," she said.

# Serena to begin Wimbledon against 113th-ranked foe

Serena Williams will begin her Wimbledon comeback by facing Harmony Tan, a 24-year-old from France who is ranked 113th and owns a 2-6 career record in Grand Slam matches.

The placement of Williams in the women's bracket was the most anticipated aspect of Friday's draw at the All England Club. She is making her first appearance in singles at any tournament since she hurt her right leg and stopped playing during the first set of her first-round match at Centre Court a year ago.

Because of her lack of activity over the past 12 months, Williams - who has been No 1 in the rankings - is outside the WTA's top 1,200 this week and so could have ended up anywhere in the field and against any opponent in the first round. She only returned to the tour this week by playing two doubles matches at a tuneup event in England.

While the 40-year-old

American's track record merit seeding, the All England Club now adheres strictly to the rankings in determining how it seeds players.

Williams has won seven Wimbledon championships, part of her total of 23 Grand Slam singles titles, a record for the professional era. Tan, meanwhile, will be making her debut at the grass-court tournament.

If Williams gets past Tan, next up could be a match against Sara Sorribes Tormo, who is seeded 32nd but has never been past the second round at the All England Club or the third round at any major in 19 past appearances.

The third round potentially would put Williams against



a tougher test: No 6-seeded Karolina Pliskova, who was the runner-up to Ash Barty last year at Wimbledon and also reached the final of the 2016 U.S. Open - beating Williams in the semifinals there.

Barty retired at age 25 in March and so is not defending her title when play begins on Monday. That also leaves open the question of which woman will have the honor of playing the first match at Centre Court on Tuesday, a slot traditionally reserved for the prior year's champion.

The two most likely choices would seem to be No 1 Iga Swiatek, who enters on a 35-match winning streak and is coming off a title at the French Open, or Simona Halep, who won the 2019 trophy.

## Kvitova vs Ostapenko in Eastbourne final

Two-time Wimbledon champion Petra Kvitova advanced to her first grass-court final in four years by beating Beatriz Haddad Maia 7-6 (5), 6-4 at Eastbourne on Friday.

Kvitova will face defending champion Jelena Ostapenko in the final. The eighth-seeded Latvian defeated 12th-seeded Camila Giorgi 6-2, 6-2 in the other semifinal match.

Haddad Maia had won 12 straight matches on grass including back-to-back singles titles in Nottingham and Birmingham over the last two weeks.

The 14th-seeded Kvitova reached her first final of 2022 and first grass-court final since Birmingham in 2018. Kvitova earned the only



service break of the match to begin the second set against the 15th-seeded Brazilian.

The 32-year-old Czech player's only career loss in five grass-court finals was to Marion Bartoli at Eastbourne in 2011, when Kvitova went on to win Wimbledon for the first time.

## Medvedev loses to Bautista Agut in Mallorca quarters

Top-ranked Daniil Medvedev will remain without a title on grass this season after a straight-set loss to Roberto Bautista Agut in the quarterfinals of the Mallorca Championships.

Medvedev lost 6-3, 6-2 after entering the match with an 8-2 record on the surface for the year, with his losses coming in consecutive finals in Germany and the Netherlands.

Medvedev, who will not play at Wimbledon because of the ban on Russians after the war in Ukraine, needed to come from behind to get past Aslan Karatsev in the round of 16 on



Wednesday.

Medvedev, the defending champion in Mallorca, had only one break opportunity against the 20th-ranked Bautista Agut, who had advanced without having to play in the last 16 because Nick Kyrgios withdrew with an abdominal injury.

# Archery WC Stage 3: Compound mixed pair in final

Indian archers assured themselves of a second medal in the World Cup Stage 3 with ace duo of Abhishek Verma and Jyothi Surekha Vennam sailing into the compound mixed team final here on Friday.

A day after Deepika Kumari and Co. cruised into the final of recurve women's team event to confirm their first medal of the meet, the compound mixed pair of Verma and Jyothi followed suit, defeating Estonia's Robin Jaatma and Lisell Jaatma 156-151 in a lopsided semifinal.

The Indian duo will face fifth seed France in the com-

Making a comeback after more than seven months, world

number 3 Jyothi, who was sidelined in the Asian Games trial, is also in the hunt for an individual medal, having advanced

into the semi-final.

A day after Lisell gave Jyothi a tough fight in the individual quarterfinal, the Estonian along with her teammate Robin failed to create much pressure and slipped behind after the Indian pair had a perfect first round.

Maintaining their consistency, Verma and Jyothi extended their lead to five points in the third round that proved decisive, even as their rivals levelled it 38-38 in the final set of arrows.

Having got a bye into the pre-quarters, third seeded India began their mixed team campaign eliminating Puerto Rico by a handsome eight-point margin (158-150).

# Milan begin Scudetto defence against Udinese in mid-August

AC Milan will begin their Serie A title defence with the visit of Udinese after the 2022/23 season's fixture list was announced on Friday.

Stefano Pioli's side then face Atalanta, Bologna and Sassuolo before hosting the first Milan derby of the season in early September.

Milan took the Scudetto from Inter on the final day of last season's enthralling title race and will likely be doing battle with their local rivals -- who are set to bring back Romelu Lukaku -- for the title in a campaign which starts earlier than usual.

The opening round of fixtures are on August 13, due to the World Cup which kicks off in Qatar in November, and finishes on June 4 next year.



The first week of the season will be held around when Italian families traditionally set off to the seaside, lakes or mountains on holiday to escape the intense summer heat.

The league will break from November 13 to make space for the World Cup but unlike the Premier League will not return in December, with the action starting up again on January 4.

Inter start with a trip to Serie B champions Lecce, one of only three teams from Italy's southern regions, before facing Spezia, Lazio and promoted Cremonese before their first

local derby of the season.

Should the season go down to the wire as it did in May, there are some big matches in the final few weeks which could have an impact on the destination of the title.

### BERLUSCONI BACK

Juventus, hotly-tipped to sign free agent Paul Pogba, host Milan in the penultimate round of fixtures, when Inter await rivals Atalanta at the San Siro.

The week before Inter travel south to Napoli, who were well in the title race last season until they fell away in the final weeks of the campaign.

Milan fans will welcome back former owner Silvio Berlusconi in late October when promoted Monza visit the San Siro during the 11th round of fixtures.

# Daruvala completes successful Formula 1 test with McLaren

Young Indian racer Jehan Daruvala made a successful Formula 1 test debut this week with eight-time constructors' winner McLaren and is now eligible for a Super Licence.

Super Licence, which is needed to compete in F1.

Jehan, who ran trouble-free on both the days, currently races with Italian team Prema in the Formula 2 championship, the feeder series that sits one step below Formula 1, and is third in

the overall standings.

"I really enjoyed my first time driving a Formula One car. I felt immediately at home and while it was physically more demanding than anything I have driven in the past, I didn't have any issues with my fitness," Jehan was quoted as saying in a media release on Friday.

According to Jehan, the experience gave him good understanding of how teams operate on an F1 weekend.

"As a result, we were able to work through the run plan well and complete everything we had mapped out. We did a mixture of high-fuel long runs and as well as shorter, low-fuel runs on different tyre compounds. That gave me a good understanding of how teams operate on an F1 weekend."



# Surya, Sanju set to be in playing XI against Ireland

However, if one looks at coach Dravid's philosophy, he doesn't believe in casting his net too wide and exploring too many options. He also needs to close in on spots by the time India play the Asia Cup.

While Rituraj Gaikwad has not been very successful, the Chennai Super Kings opener might just get two more chances against a weak Ireland side, against whom he can score some runs and get his confidence back.

Ishan Kishan, who has all but sealed the reserve opener's slot for the next few months, will continue in his role for the time being and will open with regular skipper Rohit Sharma in the England leg of the T20Is also.

Stand-in captain Hardik Pandya, who batted at No 5 in the last series, is expected to continue in that position with Dinesh Karthik coming a slot below him.

However, with Karthik being assigned a specific role, he could also come ahead of Pandya, depending on the situation.

But it is still not clear if Dravid or Laxman will try out 'Jammu Express' Umrani Malik or blockhole specialist Arshdeep Singh in this series, or continue with Bhuvneshwar Kumar and Avesh Khan, with Axar Patel and Yuzvendra Chahal as the spinners.

Vice-captain Smriti Mandhana and Sabbhineni Meghana endured an off day in office and the visitors would need the duo to click if India are to put on a big total.

It was left to Jemimah Rodrigues, who made her comeback to the side after a while, and Deepti Sharma to

provide the late burst and take India to the winning total. Even though Rodrigues and Deepti did the rescue act, the Indian think tank would want the top-order to do better job.

The Indian bowlers, on the other hand, were right on the money with the spin trio of Radha (2/22), Deepti (1/9) and part-timer Shafali (1/10) shinning bright on the low and slow wicket.

With the same venue hosting all the three T20s, spinners of both teams will play vital roles.

Sri Lanka too would be hoping for a better effort from their batters.

Middle-order batter Kavisha Dilhari (47 not out) remained stranded as she failed to get support from the other hand. The likes of skipper Chamari Athapaththu, Vishmi Gunaratne, Harshitha Madavi and Nilakshi de Silva will have to take more responsibility in the batting unit.

On the bowling front, spin duo of Inoka Ranaweera (3/30) and Oshadi Ranasinghe (2/22) would look for support from their opening bowlers to keep Indian batters quiet.

The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) on Friday introduced separate red ball and white ball central contracts for its players with increased retainers but would discourage its elite players from competing in foreign leagues, for which it is ready to pay them compensatory money.

The PCB said that the Board of Governors meeting has approved an annual budget of 15 billion rupees for the fiscal year 2022-23 with 78 per cent allocated for cricket activities.

"As part of its strategy to incentivise, reward and encourage its high-performing elite cricketers, as well as to narrow the gap in salaries compared to players of other countries, the BoG has approved changes in the men's central contracts structure,"



the PCB said in a statement.

From July 1, separate red and white-ball contracts will be given with increased retainers. The number of centrally contracted players has been increased from 20 to 33.

The Board announced a 10 per cent increase in match fees across formats and also an increase in match fee for non-playing members from 50 per cent to 70 per cent of the overall match fee.

A captaincy allowance has also been introduced to compensate the team leader for the additional responsibilities that come with that role.

PCB Chairman, Ramiz Raja also announced at a media conference in Lahore that the Board has also set up a special fund for current players who get offers for playing in foreign leagues.

## Ramiz brushes aside rumours of being sacked

Pakistan Cricket Board Chairman Ramiz Raja has obliquely said that he wants to continue in the top post, following prolonged speculations that he was likely to be sacked by the ruling government. There have been speculations for months that Prime Minister Shahbaz Sharif will soon bring in his own nominee to replace Ramiz as PCB Chairman.

Shahbaz recently also held meetings with three former Chairmen of the board, Khalid Mahmood, Zaka Ashraf and Najam Sethi on cricket matters leading to more speculations that Ramiz would be told to go home.

"It's been two months now and we can't live on speculations. If something had to happen it would have happened by now. Look unless you give continuity a chance nothing will improve in

Pakistan cricket," Ramiz said. "Cricket gives me excitement. I have a lot of other options. The PM is our line in charge and I have put in a request to meet him and brief him on what we are doing and our plans for the future."

Ramiz said that his goal is to improve cricket in Pakistan and the good work should not be disregarded.

"There is no ego issue here, we just want to improve Pakistan cricket. If the constitution allows a change fine but just because of tradition you should not undo the good work," he said.



## Oz beat SL by 4 wickets

Wicketkeeper-batsman Alex Carey's unbeaten 45 and inspired bowling helped Australia to a four-wicket consolation win over Sri Lanka in the fifth ODI on Friday.

Australia bowled out the hosts for 160, a tricky total on a bowling-friendly Colombo pitch the tourists overhauled with 10.3 overs to spare.

Fast bowlers Josh Hazlewood, Pat Cummins and spinner Matthew Kuhnemann took two wickets each.

Chamika Karunaratne hit a valiant 75 for Sri Lanka, who won the five-match series 3-2 after they had taken an unbeatable lead in the fourth match.

Australia were in trouble at 4-50 when the left-handed Carey and Marnus Labuschagne, who made 31, put on a key stand of 51 to set up the chase.

Teenage left-arm spinner Dunith Wellalage took three wickets including David Warner, for 10, and Glenn Maxwell, for 16, but the left-handed Carey kept his calm.

Earlier Sri Lanka slipped to 85-8 before Karunaratne, who improved on his previous ODI best of 44 not out, and debutant Pramod Madushan put on a stubborn stand of 58 for the ninth wicket.

The tourists had quickly rattled the Sri Lankans after Hazlewood removed the openers inside five overs and finished with figures of 2-22.

Charith Asalanka was run out for 14 after a misunderstanding with his partner Kusal Mendis, who made 26 but was out hit wicket off Glenn Maxwell on the next ball.

Kuhnemann, a left-arm spinner, then struck twice in one over including skipper Dasun Shanaka for one as Sri Lanka slipped further to 85-8.

But Karunaratne fought back as he reached his maiden ODI fifty with a boundary off Cummins to celebrate with a fist pump.

Cummins finally got out Karunaratne, who hit eight fours and two sixes in his stay, to wrap up the innings.

# Boult strikes as England slump to 55-6 against Black Caps

Trent Boult took three wickets as England slumped to 55-6 on the second day of the third Test on Friday, with their batting frailties returning to haunt them.

England last week went 2-0 up in the three-match series playing bold and aggressive cricket under their new leadership pair of captain Ben Stokes and Test coach Brendon McCullum, a former New Zealand skipper.

But replying to Test world champions New Zealand's first innings 329, England lost six wickets within 12 overs at Headingley, most of them due to good bowling rather than cavalier batting.

Left-hander Alex Less, dropped in the slips off the first ball of the innings, was bowled by a superb Boult leg-cutter four balls later.

Ollie Pope, fresh from a hundred in the second Test at Trent Bridge, was also cleaned up by Boult to leave England 14-2.

The out-of-form Crawley was next to fall, bowled middle stump by Boult before Tim Southee had star batsman Joe Root caught behind for five on his Yorkshire home ground.

That left England 21-4 and although skipper Stokes counter-attacked by going down the pitch to drive Southee for six, he could only

# Madhya Pradesh close in on maiden Ranji title

Unheralded Yash Dubey and Shubham Sharma made the biggest stage of Indian domestic cricket their own with well-crafted centuries, that pulled the rug from under heavyweights Mumbai's feet as Madhya Pradesh took a giant leap towards their maiden Ranji Trophy title, here on Friday.

Mumbai's first innings score of 374 looked reasonably good on the second day but Dubey (133, 336 balls) and Sharma (116, 215 balls) added 222 runs for the second wicket to take MP to a solid 368 for 3 at the end of day three.

Madhya Pradesh now need only seven more runs to take a decisive first innings lead and unless they suffer a collapse in the fourth innings, the title is theirs for taking.

MP had lost to Karnataka when the

last time they competed in a Ranji Trophy final in the 1998-99 season.

The duo took the sting out of Mumbai attack with some 'khadoos' (stubborn) batting straight out of Chandrakant Pandit's coaching play book as 245 runs were scored through the whole day but more effectively, they ran Mumbai attack ragged with their solid game plan.

Rajat Patidar, one of the heroes of RCB's campaign in the IPL, then used his new-found confidence to score an unbeaten 67 with 13 boundaries.

MP would certainly want to stretch their innings as much as possible so that Mumbai have no chance to make a comeback in the game.

The Chinnaswamy Stadium track didn't show signs of wear and tear and the bright sunshine only helped the MP batters to settle down easily against a Mumbai attack which was at one level ordinary.



The biggest disappointment was their left-arm spinner Shams Mulani (1/117 in 40 overs), who bowled too many loose deliveries.

Veteran Dhawal Kulkarni (21-3-51-0) and the seasoned Tushar Deshpande (24-8-73-1) were also below-par as they consistently gave drivable length the batters in the morning session.

Instead of conjuring up maiden overs and building the pressure slowly, within first half an hour, they allowed Dubey and Sharma to easily hit multiple cover drives to get their eye in.

Kulkarni, the only man in this set-up with experience of winning a Ranji Trophy, bowled too many deliveries outside the off-stump which were left alone.

The only time he looked menacing was when Dubey had taken his eyes off a short ball and was knocked down.

While Dubey hit 14 boundaries and

Sharma had 15 hits and a maximum to his credit, what stood out during their partnership was their running between the wickets.

That Dubey (613 runs) and Sharma (578 runs) have been standout performers for MP this season was evident in their on-field communication, where they would tap the ball towards mid-on or mid-off to steal those quick singles.

Dubey in fact after scoring his hundred did repeat the 'Sidhu Moosewala' celebration (thigh thump and index finger pointed towards sky) but it was more about driving home a point for Sarfaraz Khan, who was sledging the duo.

By the time, Sharma was caught behind off Avasthi and Dubey gave Mulani something to cheer after another 72-run third wicket stand, some of the Mumbai players were on their hunches.
