Sex work legal, police can't punish them: SC

Treat sex workers with dignity, don't abuse them, verbally or physically, apex court orders police

In a landmark judgment that will come as relief for millions of sex workers, the Supreme Court has decided to provide legal protection to them and directed police forces in all States and Union Territories to treat them with dignity and not to abuse them, verbally or physically.

"Sex workers are entitled to equal protection of the law. Criminal law must apply equally in all cases, on the basis of 'age' and 'consent'. When it is clear that the sex worker is an adult and is participating with consent, the police must refrain from interfering or taking any criminal action," a three-judge Bench led by Justice L Nageswara Rao said.

The court passed the order exercising its special powers under Article 142 of the Constitution.

The court said the constitutional protection that is given



to all individuals in this country shall be kept in mind by the authorities who have a duty under the Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956.

Any sex worker, who is a victim of sexual assault, should be provided with all facilities available to a survivor of sexual assault, including immediate medical assistance, in accordance with law, it said.

The court held that the child of a sex worker should not be separated from the mother merely on the ground that she is in the sex trade.

"Basic protection of human decency and dignity extends to sex workers and their children," the court noted.

verbally and physically, subject them to violence or coerce them into any sexual activity," said the SC.

The court also directed the police not to discriminate against sex workers who are subjected to sexual offences and provide them with every facility, including immediate medico-legal care.

The court also said the Press Council of India should be urged to issue appropriate guidelines for the media to take utmost care not to reveal the identities of sex workers, during arrest, raid and rescue operations, whether as victims or accused and not to publish or telecast any photos that would result in disclosure of such identities.

Besides, the newly introduced Section 354C, IPC which makes voyeurism a criminal offence, should be strictly enforced against electronic media, in order to prohibit telecasting photos of sex workers with their clients in the garb of capturing the rescue operation," it said.

It also directed the State Governments to do a survey of shelter homes so that cases of adult women detained against their will can be reviewed and processed for release in a time-bound manner.

The court also noted that if a minor is found living in a brothel or with sex workers, it should not be presumed that the child was trafficked.

"It has been noticed that the attitude of the police to sex workers is often brutal and violent. It is as if they are a class whose rights are not recognised."

The police and other law enforcement agencies should be sensitised to the rights of sex workers who also enjoy all basic human rights and other rights guaranteed in the Constitution to all citizens. Police should treat all sex workers with dignity and should not abuse them, both

Tamil language eternal, its culture global, says Modi

PM takes swipe at KCR, says 'parivaarvadi' greatest enemy of democracy

In his address after inaugurating new completed projects and laying foundation stone for fresh schemes in various sectors, including housing, Modi quoted a popular verse of nationalist poet Subramania Bharathi and said in every field someone from Tamil Nadu was excelling.

Recently, Modi said he had hosted the Indian Deaflympics contingent at his residence. The PM said this time it was India's best performance in the tournament. "Do you know out of the 16 medals we have won, a youngster from Tamil Nadu had a role in 6 of those medals and this is among the best contribution to the team."

He referred to the Subramania Bharathi chair at the Banaras Hindu University in his Varanasi constituency and the full funding to the Central Tamil Classical

Earlier, Modi and Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao on

Thursday took apparent potshots at each other, even as the TRS supreme gave a miss to the PM for the second time in a year during an official visit to his State.

While Modi lashed out at family politics saying "parivaarvadi" is democracy's "greatest enemy," KCR, who flew to Bengaluru to meet former PM HD Deve Gowda, said despite "bhaashanbaazi" (rhetoric), industries were closing down, the nation's GDP was crashing and the rupee was falling drastically compared to the US dollar and said all sections of the society were suffering.

In Chennai, Modi said India is providing all possible support to the economic crisis-hit Sri Lanka including financial, fuel, food, medicine and other essential items and recalled that he was the first Indian Prime Minister to visit Jaffna earlier.

Pointing to the new schemes, including those launched and foundation stone for new projects, he said the Bengaluru - Chennai Expressway would connect two key centres of economic growth.

Tamil Nadu Governor RN Ravi, Chief Minister MK Stalin and Union Minister L Murugan among others participated in the event, held coinciding with the PM's maiden visit to Tamil Nadu after the DMK came to power last year.

After babu's dog row, players' time in stadium extended

Revenue Secretary, his wife shifted out of national Capital

After reports surfaced that athletes at Delhi's Thyagraj Stadium were forced to cut short their practice because an IAS officer sought to walk his dog there, the Arvind Kejriwal-led Government on Thursday ordered all stadiums to remain open for players till 10 pm.

The order came after reports of Delhi Revenue Secretary Sanjeev Khirwar using the Thyagraj Stadium to walk his dog surfaced. Athletes were allegedly asked to wind up early to facilitate the walk.

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said the Government is issuing instructions to all sports facilities to stay open for sportspersons till 10 pm.

"It has come to my notice that sportspersons are facing

problems because of the heat and the stadiums get closed by 6 or 7 pm. We are issuing instructions that all sports facilities should remain open till 10 pm so that the sportsperson can use them," Kejriwal told reporters.

On Thursday evening Khirwar, a 1994 batch IAS officer, was transferred to Ladakh. His wife Rinku Dugga, a 1994 batch IAS officer, has been transferred to Arunachal Pradesh. Sources said that the Centre has taken his conduct at Thyagraj Stadium seriously.

Earlier, Delhi Deputy CM Manish Sisodia on Thursday tweeted that the Chief Minister has extended the timings of all stadiums in Delhi till 10 pm.

"News reports have brought to our notice that certain sports facilities are being closed early causing inconvenience to sportsmen who wish to play till late night."

Kejriwal has directed that all Delhi Government sports facilities to stay open for sportspersons till 10pm," Sisodia tweeted.

Meanwhile, stadium administrator Anil Chaudhury denied the allegations and said official timings were being adhered to.

Terming it shameful, Minister of State for Housing and Urban Affairs Kaushal Kishore said, "It's shameful that sportspersons have to empty the stadium (Delhi's Thyagraj Stadium Complex) premises because an IAS officer wants to walk with his dog. The officer should apologise. This is a misuse of his authority."

Earlier the Delhi BJP had demanded action against Khirwar for forcing the players to vacate the stadium. The service department comes under the Lieutenant Governor.

Noted activist and lawyer Prashant Bhushan wrote, "Wow! Stadium is emptied, athletes told to leave, so that Delhi Govt's Principal Secretary Revenue Khirwar can walk his dog! Certainly an appropriate babu to serve the Aam Aadmi Party Government."

4 more pilgrims die in Kedarnath, toll 41

All four deceased were over 60 years of age, said Rudraprayag Chief Medical Officer BK Shukla.

They were identified as Nandu, 65, from Nalanda in Bihar, Haridwar Tiwari, 62, from Balrampur in Uttar Pradesh, Ram Narayan Tripathi, 65, from Lucknow, and Hemraj Soni, 61, from Bara in Rajasthan. Yamunotri has reported 20 deaths and Gangotri four.

NML signs MoU with Pune-based firm for recycling of scrap

National Metallurgical Laboratory (NML) has entered into an agreement with Recy Energy Pvt. Ltd., Pune to transfer a breakthrough technology for the recycling of scrap, waste, and used lithium Ion Batteries (LIB).

Dr. S.K. Pal, head, research planning & business development division, CSIR-NML, and Dr. Masood Khajenoori, founder & CEO, Recy Energy Pvt. Ltd signed the technology transfer agreement in presence of Dr. Indranil Chatteraj, director, CSIR-NML, Arindam Das from Recy Energy Pvt. Ltd, and Dr. Sanjay Kumar, Head-Metal Extraction & Recycling Di-



vision, CSIR-NML. During the agreement ceremony Dr. Abhilash, Principal Scientist, Dr. Pratima Meshram, Principal Scientist, Dr. TC Alex, Sr. Principal Scientist, Dr. A Vidyadhar, Sr. Principal Scientist, Rohit Meshram, Scientist, and Sudhakara Rao K, Technical Officer were present.

The burgeoning automotive and transport sector has been surging ahead world-

wide, witnessing sharp growth in the realm of Lithium battery-based electrical vehicles across developed and emerging nations. India generates over 50,000 tonnes of lithium battery waste every year, which is expected to increase three-fold by 2025. While the customer's lucrative demands and stringent environmental regulations ensure the development of sustainable

technology for Lithium battery recycling. Nonetheless, CSIR-NML comes up with a waste-to-wealth creation technology that addresses all the global challenges that are prevailing at present.

Dr. Masood Khajenoori mentioned that their quest for a universal technology, which is capable of treating all types of lithium ion batteries has ended with this technology transfer agreement and is poised to help India in fulfilling the goals of the Swachh Bharat Mission and the Smart Cities initiative. This indigenous technology shall pave the way for the extraction of battery-grade Nickel, Lithium, Cobalt, and Manganese apart from Copper, Aluminium, and rejuvenated

graphite, as well as recycling of solvents used in the process.

Speaking at the event, Dr. Indranil Chatteraj mentioned the role of CSIR in a Mission Mode Project in developing this technology.

Further, he added that a 100 kg throughout LIB recycling pilot plant is in the phase of realization under this project on a hire-operate-transfer mode for new generation entrepreneurs and established recyclers in battery recycling. Dr. Sanjay Kumar, Head-MER Division, CSIR-NML mentioned the need of leveraging a universal technology in battery recycling that holds the key to process economics and sustainability.

Polling parties dispatched for last round of elections

Ahead of the fourth and last phase three-tier Panchayat poll today, polling teams were dispatched on Thursday under the supervision of the Deputy Commissioner Ramesh Gholap. In the fourth phase, a total of 7 blocks of Garhwa subdivision, including Meral, Garhwa, Danda, Dandai, Kandi, Bardiha and Mahiaon blocks will be held. The polling team has left which will leave at the identified cluster and after the end of the poll, they will deposit the polled ballot box and other election material at Agriculture Market Committee, Garhwa on the same day.

Polling will be held at 1121 polling stations from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. The Deputy Commissioner said that all the preparations for the voting have been completed, tomorrow the voting will be conducted in a fearless, fair and peaceful manner under the Garhwa subdivision.

The DC said that separate medical kits have been



arranged for all the constituted polling parties and police forces engaged in the polling work.

Deputation of necessary medicines and medical team for first aid at the cluster will also be done by the civil surgeon, as well as the availability of ambulances has been ensured in all CHCs.

Polling personnel have been dispatched from the dispatch center with full preparations, while proper arrangements have been made for their stay at the cluster by providing all the basic facilities. In Garhwa sub-division, voting will be

held for 11 posts of Zilla Parishad members, 111 posts of Panchayat Samiti members, 85 posts of Mukhiya and 878 posts of Gram Panchayat members. Thus 3,930 candidates are contesting for a total of 1,085 posts.

A total of 4,17,176 voters will exercise their franchise in the fourth phase of elections, which includes a total of 2,20,613 male voters and 1,96,563 female voters.

The total number of voters with disabilities is 8,091 while the number of voters who have increased in comparison to the last election is 91,224.

Jugsalai railway overbridge project to be complete by year end

The much awaited multi-crore Jugsalai railway overbridge project (ROB) in Jamshedpur is expected to be completed by the end of this year. Sources said the work for the new approach road is in full swing.

The officials of the Road Construction Department (RCD) said that the construction is going at full speed and it will be completed soon.

"Though the work of approach road construction had stopped in the past due to its design issue which has already



been sorted out and construction work resumed. We will complete the approach road construction in the next few months," an official of RCD's Jamshedpur division.

He pointed out the design of the approach road has been revised and its cost has also escalated to Rs 44 crores. The official said the railway has al-

ready constructed the overbridge and after the work of the approach road is to be completed by December, the Jugsalai railway overbridge will get operational for the public. About one lakh people from the densely-populated Jugsalai and Bagbera localities of the city cross the Jugsalai level crossing located between Tatanagar and Adityapur stations every day. About 90 trains, including goods trains, pass through the Jugsalai level crossing.

The railway had finalised the blueprint for the Rs 21.54 crore project. The road over

bridge was a long pending demand of the people residing at Jugsalai. Sources informed that of the 21.54 crores, 9.77 crores was to be spent by the railway, whereas the remaining to be borne by the state government. However, now the budget has escalated.

The road over bridge would ensure smooth traffic and avoid decongestion as the commuters face it now while crossing the level crossing. The existing Jugsalai roundabout will remain where it is not, but its size will be reduced marginally. Peeved over snarls and mishaps at the crossing,

the residents of the densely-populated Jugsalai and adjoining Bagbera localities had set up Sarbadaliya Sangharsh Samiti (SSS) cutting across party lines.

Following repeated agitation by the SSS, the railway in the year 2011 had taken the initiative to construct an overbridge in collaboration with the RCD and decided to set up the railway overbridge for Rs 16 crores. As there were issues for both the railway as well as the RCD, the project was delayed by over a decade and the project cost escalated to Rs 45 crore.

spot till late afternoon. Family members took away the body of another. This happens to be the second incident here in recent months . Earlier, a minor girl had lost her legs in a similar incident but despite reporting to police illegal mining still continues unabated .

Then Giridih MP CP Choudhary had inspected the spot and later had raised the issue in parliament too.

CBI raids 16 locations in country in national games scam

Former Minister Bandhu Tirkey's residences searched

The CBI on Thursday carried out a nationwide raid at as many as 16 locations in Jharkhand, Bihar, and Delhi in the 34th national games scam.

"In Jharkhand raids were carried out in Ranchi, Dhanbad, Bokaro, Godda, and Dumka. Thus, a total of 16 locations were raided whereas in Bihar two locations in Patna and another two locations in Delhi have been raided. In Ranchi, the house of former HRD minister Bandhu Tirkey was raided whereas in Delhi the premises of RK Anand were raided," said a senior CBI official.

The CBI said that raids were carried out against 13 named accused in the case which the CBI is investigating on the order of Jharkhand Bandhu Tirkey, the working president of the

Congress was minister of sports and youth affairs when the preparations for the national game were going on. He was in Delhi when the raid was started. The Congress criticized the raid and said that it was done with a political motive.

The CBI said that certain incriminating documents have been recovered during the raid. It further said that it registered a case against Bandhu Tirkey, former MP and the then Working Chairman of National Games Organizing Committee RK Anand, treasurer, and others

including the then Director (Sports), Govt. of Jharkhand; the then Organising Secretary, National Games Organizing Committee; the then Treasurer, Jharkhand Olympic Association. The CBI lodged two FIRs at the Anti-Corruption Unit of the CBI in Ranchi related to the 34th National Games scam. In the first case RC0242022A0001, the FIR was lodged against unknown public servants and private persons. The FIR was lodged under sections 120 (B), 420 of IPC, and sections 13 (2) and 13 (1)

(D) of the Prevention of Corruption Act. The investigation has been assigned to Surendra Depawat, who is posted as DSP at the anti-corruption branch of the CBI at Patna in Bihar. Sources in the CBI said that this FIR is related to a scam in the construction of the sports infrastructure during the national game.

The second FIR RC0242022A0002 has been lodged against R. K. Anand who was (Working Chairman of 34th National Games Organising Committee cum-President, Jharkhand Olympic Association, S.M. Hashmi, Organising Secretary, 34th National Games Organising Committee cum-Secretary General, Jharkhand Olympic Association and Madhukant Pathak, treasurer, 34th National Games Organising Committee cum-Treasurer, Jharkhand Olympic Association. Investigation of this case has been assigned to Shri Narayan, inspector of CBI posted at the anti-corruption branch in Patna. Bholanath Singh had

lodge the first FIR. He alleged that a wide level of corruption was done in organizing the national games. On this basis the Vigilance Bureau lodged an FIR 49/2010 and filed two charge sheets. It claimed that Rs 28.38 crore were embezzled.

On April 11, The Jharkhand High Court directed the CBI to investigate the national games scam. It also asked the CBI to investigate the role of police officials and bureaucrats.

The double bench of Chief Justice Dr. Ravi Ranjan and Justice Sujit Narayan Prasad ordered this after hearing a bunch of PIL filed by Sushil Kumar Singh Mantu, Surya Singh Besra of Jharkhand Against Corruption, and Pankaj Yadav. The court said that the Anti-Corruption Bureau of Jharkhand was not in a position to investigate this case as high-profile persons are involved. The 34th National Games was held from 12 February to 26 February in 2011. But it was originally scheduled for 2007.

Over 59 lakh voters to vote in final round of polling today

Stage is set for the fourth and final round of panchayat polls on Friday. Around 58 lakh voters spread across 1,299 panchayats in 23 districts will elect their local bodies representatives. Out of 59.16 lakh voters the female voters is 28.20 lakh while the rest are male voters. The voters will decide the fate of 35,504 candidates.

Out of these 35,504 candidates whose fate will be decided these include 15,875 panchayat members, 1,299 mukhiyas, 1,587 panchayat committee representatives and 159 zilla parishad members for a total 18,920 posts. However, a total of 6,950 candidates have already been declared winners unopposed on posts of 6,811 panchayat members, five mukhiyas, 133 panchayat committee representatives and one zilla parishad member in the fourth phase of the elections, officials from State Election Commission said.

Like other phases, panchayat polls in Jharkhand are not being held on party lines. Officials at SEC said that preparations for the fourth and final round of elections have been completed. Adequate security personnel will be deployed at polling booths for fair voting. The voting will be held from 7 am to 3 pm. The counting of votes for the fourth and final

round of election will be held on May 31.

Panchayat polls in the state are being held in four phases with the first phase of polls taking place on May 14. The second and third phases were held on May 19 and 24.

In the third phase of Jharkhand Panchayat Election there was around 70.54 percent voting. There was a lot of enthusiasm among voters from morning at the polling stations. District wise Deoghar recorded the highest voter turnout of 79.18%. The SEC expects that in the fourth round of polling too there will be record voting.

In Ranchi under the fourth phase of election voting in five blocks of district, Burmu, Khehari, Mandar, Chanhoh and Ratu, will go to polls on May 27. DC Chhavarinjan on Thursday directed officials to

fully comply with all the guidelines issued by the Election Commission. At the same time, necessary guidelines were also given on many important points related to law and order during the voting. DDC Vishal Sagar, Superintendent of Police Rural Naushad Alam and District Panchayati Raj Officer Virendra Choubey were present on the occasion.

The DC said that the polling will be held from 7 am to 3 pm. Extensive preparations have been made for fair voting. The DC said that the fair and non-discriminatory polling should be done fearlessly. He said that the Sector Magistrate and Police Officer is an important link in the election. On their alertness and efficiency, smooth voting is possible at all the polling stations of the sector.

Jharkhand first in country to launch seed distribution with blockchain system

For the first time in the history of Jharkhand, seed distribution among farmers has been initiated well ahead of the arrival of the Kharif season. Following the instruction of Chief Minister, Hemant Soren, the Directorate of Agriculture is distributing seeds to the farmers through a blockchain based seed traceability platform. Through this system, timely availability and quality of seeds is being ensured to the farmers.

In this year before the onset of Kharif the department launched seed distribution on March 11.

Director Agriculture, Neshia Oraon informed that Jharkhand is the first State in the Country to use the block chain system to measure the progress and implementation of Government schemes. "This will play a crucial role in the transpar-

ent execution of schemes. There will be a crackdown on middle men. It is the utmost priority of this Government to make quality seeds available to the farmers at the right time," she added.

"Due to timely availability of seeds, the demand for seeds from farmers has registered an increase of almost four times as compared to last year. The demand for 38,640 quintal seeds of paddy, arrhar, ragi, groundnut, maize, urad and moong has been met for the first time till May 2022. The total seed distributed in the Kharif season registered an increase of 75 per cent with an increase in the production of coarse cereals and pulses by 9 per cent and 2 per cent respectively," said Oraon.

The Agriculture Director further informed that due to the empanelment of the new government seed agency, the seed prices have come

down by 4 to 16 per cent as compared to the previous year. The budgetary allocation in the current financial year has been almost doubled from the previous year and it is Rs 40 crore for this financial year, she added.

In the Kharif season, in just one month, 101, 065 farmers have been registered in the Blockchain based seed traceability platform. Also a total of 123 Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) have been registered. The registration

process is still in progress. Through this system, along with seeds, the benefits of other Government agriculture schemes of the Directorate of Agriculture will also be provided to the registered farmers and FPOs. Receiving the benefit of the Government schemes, an OTP will be sent to the registered mobile of the farmers, through which the distribution shall be confirmed.

This system is being employed to issue supply orders from the Directorate of Agriculture and District Agriculture Officer for seed distribution and to trace the supply of seeds from seed producing agencies to the godowns. This will enable timely supply of seeds to testing laboratories, distributors, retailers and most importantly, the farmers. Along with this, the empaneled seed supplier under this system will be able to track the movement of seeds including details of the supply

order received, receipt issued by the warehouse, status of supply by various unique identifiers including QR codes.

Through the Blockchain based seed traceability platform, seed distribution centers like LAMPS, PACS, Block, Panchayat and others will be able to share their experience with the system through the learning centre as well be able to connect with the farmers' system to interact with the competent authority. This system will also ensure timely dissemination of information and quality maintenance of the supply chain of seeds, access and quality of seeds to farmers which will help in providing more robust infrastructure towards seed distribution programs in the State in the times to come. Also, this system shall create a database which will map each farmer to the benefits and the schemes that they have availed.

‘Covid killed 1.6L people in 2020’ Israel Def Min to visit India next week

The Covid-19 killed 1,60,618 people in 2020 and accounted for 8.9 per cent of the total 18.11 lakh medically certified deaths in country, according to Report on Medical Certification of Cause of Death-2020 released by Office of Registrar General of India (RGI) on Wednesday.

This is, however, higher than officially declared Union Health Ministry's Covid death count of 1,48,994 in 2020.

While Covid-19 was fourth biggest cause of medically certified deaths nationally in 2020, it was second biggest in seven States — Maharashtra (17.7 per cent), Manipur (15.7 per cent), Uttar Pradesh (15 per cent), Himachal Pradesh (13.5 per cent), Andhra Pradesh (12 per cent), Punjab (11.9 per cent) and Jharkhand (7.6 per cent).

In 2020, the most Covid deaths in absolute numbers were reported in Maharashtra (61,212) followed by Uttar Pradesh (16,489), Karnataka (15,476), Andhra Pradesh (12,193) and Delhi (8,744). Only one State — Arunachal Pradesh — and one Union Territory — Lakshadweep — did not report any medically certified Covid death during 2020, as per RGI data. For purposes of Report



on Medical Certification of Cause of Death-2020, a separate group Covid was added for data collection after pandemic broke out in 2020.

In the report, Covid deaths have been reported under two sub-heads: One in which code 'virus identified' is assigned to a "disease diagnosis of Covid 19 confirmed by laboratory testing"; and second in which code 'virus not identified' is assigned to "a clinical or epidemiological diagnosis of Covid 19 where laboratory confirmation is inconclusive or not available.

Overall, heart diseases, pneumonia and asthma together claimed highest number of lives — over 42 per cent — of total 18,11,688 medically certified deaths

registered in the country in 2020.

However, the total number of registered deaths in country was 81,15,882. A total of 5.7 per cent of total medically certified deaths were reported among infants (age less than 1 year) while about 71.7 per cent of all infant deaths were reported to be caused by certain conditions originating during perinatal period.

In age-group of 15-24 years, diseases of circulatory system claimed 18 per cent of deaths — the highest — followed by injury, poisoning, and certain other consequences of external causes, which constituted 15.7 per cent of deaths, implying age group to be peculiarly vulnerable to 'injuries and poisoning related deaths.

In a boost to the growing ties between the two countries, Defence Minister Benny Gantz of Israel will visit India next week to mark 30 years of diplomatic and defence relations. He will sign a Letter of Intent (LOI) on the occasion.

The Minister was earlier scheduled to visit New Delhi in March but had to postpone it due to terror attacks across Israel.

Moreover, Israel Prime Minister Naftali Bennett had to call off his visit to India to celebrate 30 years of establishment of diplomatic ties with India as he tested positive for corona. The visit was to take place from April 3-5.

The Israeli defence minister's visit signifies growing strategic and defence ties between India and Israel. In the last 30 years, Israel has emerged as one of the top suppliers of high end weapon



systems and allied equipment to the Indian armed forces across the entire spectrum. The two countries are now foraying into joint development and production of weapon systems.

The two countries elevated their bilateral ties to a strategic partnership during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Israel in July 2017. Since then, the relationship between the two countries has focused on expanding knowledge-based partnership, which involves collaboration in inno-

vation and research, including boosting the 'Make in India' initiative. "Defence Minister Benny Gantz will conduct an official visit to India next week (01.06) during which he will sign an LOI marking 30 years of diplomatic and defence ties between Israel and India.

A detailed schedule will be released in the coming days," a statement from his office said. Informed sources told PTI that he will be on a three-day visit to India and will meet his Indian counterpart Rajnath Singh. Other details of the trip are being worked out, they said. Some local media reports interpreted the signing of the LOI as a "special security declaration."

Prime Minister Modi said in January this year that there cannot be a better time to set new goals for taking forward India-Israel relations and asserted that the cooperation between the two countries has played a key role in the growth stories of the two nations.

In a special video message on the completion of 30 years

of full-fledged diplomatic relations between India and Israel, Modi said this period has been very important for both countries.

Israel Prime Minister Naftali Bennett has earlier described the "deep relationship" between India and Israel as one coming from the heart and not being about interests and asked Prime Minister Modi to work together to take the bilateral ties to "a whole new level".

Though India had recognised Israel on September 17, 1950, full-fledged diplomatic relations between the countries were established on January 29, 1992.

Since then, the bilateral relations between both countries have developed into multifaceted strategic partnerships.

Earlier in January, Israel's envoy to India Naor Gilon said the 30th anniversary of India-Israel diplomatic ties is a good opportunity to look ahead and shape the next 30 years of relations.

K'taka Cong head Shivakumar, others booked under PMLA

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has filed a chargesheet under the anti-money laundering law against Karnataka Congress president D K Shivakumar and others, officials said on Thursday.

The prosecution complaint has been filed under various sections of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) before a Delhi court, they said.

The federal probe agency, in the chargesheet, has included the statements of various people it recorded during the course of investigation and the

evidence it gathered. Speaking to reporters in Bengaluru, Shivakumar said all "political weapons" were being used against him, ahead of the Karnataka assembly polls expected to be held next year.

He claimed that the chargesheet is "part of a plan to eliminate people, whom the ruling dispensation fear may create trouble for them politically or don't surrender to them", adding that he is ready to "face everything".

The ED had in September 2018 registered a money laundering case against Shivakumar, Anjaneya Hanumanthaiah, an employee

CBI raids ex-J'khand Sports Min in multi-crore equipment purchases

The CBI on Thursday conducted searches at 16 locations, including the residence of former Jharkhand Sports Minister Bandhu Turkey in the then BJP-led Arjun Munda Government, over alleged irregularities in multi-crore equipment purchases for the 34th National Games 2011 held in Ranchi, officials said.

Besides Turkey, who is now the working president of the Congress in the state, the CBI also searched the premises of noted lawyer R K Anand, who was the working chairman of the National Games Organising Committee, in the national capital. The premises of former director of sports of



the state P C Mishra, organising secretary of national games Madhukant Pathak and organising secretary H M Hashmi are also being searched, the officials said.

As part of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) operation, seven places in Ranchi and five locations in Dhanbad are also being searched, they said. Turkey was recently convicted for amassing disproportionate assets by a Jharkhand court

and stripped of his assembly membership. He was a close confidante of Babul Marandi of the Jharkhand Vikas Morcha (Prajaantantik) before Marandi decided to merge the outfit with the BJP.

Tirkey did not agree with Marandi's decision and joined the Congress after the 2019 assembly elections.

The case of alleged corruption in the purchase of games equipment was probed by the state anti-corruption branch and later, handed over to the CBI by the Jharkhand High Court in April this year.

The order was passed by a division bench of Chief Justice Dr Ravi Ranjan and Justice Sujit Narayan Prasad while hearing a public interest liti-

gation filed by Sushil Kumar Singh in 2018 seeking a speedy inquiry into the alleged National Games scam.

The bench observed that the ACB had not concluded its investigation even after more than a decade of the games being hosted by the Jharkhand government.

In his petition, Singh had mentioned that the expenditure incurred in hosting the National Games in the state had been pegged at Rs 28.38 crore.

He had claimed that public money was squandered by office bearers of the National Games' organising committee who embezzled money by quoting high prices of sports equipment and accessories.

Naidu will be accompanied by Minister of State for Health Bharati Pravin Pawar and MPs Sushil Kumar Modi, Vijay Pal Singh Tomar and P Raveendranath.

New Delhi: The CBI on Thursday arrested promoter of ABIL group of companies, Avinash Bhosale, in connection with the DHFL-Yes bank loan case. The agency had conducted multiple searches at his premises last month.

APPLICATION OF JOB, CANDIDATE'S LEGAL RIGHT

New Delhi: A candidate who has applied for a job does not have a legal right to insist that the recruitment process set in motion be carried to its logical end, the Supreme Court has said. A bench of Justices K M Joseph and Hrishikesh Roy said that even the inclusion of a candidate in the select list may not provide the candidate with such a right.

KEY ACCUSED IN TERROR ATTACK CASE ARRESTED

New Delhi: The NIA has arrested a person believed to be a key accused in the Sunjwan terror attack case that happened in April on the outskirts of Jammu. The accused, Abid Ahmad Mir of Putrigam in south Kashmir's Pulwama, is alleged to be an overground worker of the banned Jaish-e-Mohammed.

SC permits Maha to submit proposal for 20 open shelters under Child Protection Services scheme

The Supreme Court has permitted the Maharashtra Government to submit a proposal to start 20 open shelters under the Child Protection Services (CPS) scheme for the 2022-2023 financial year to provide community-based facilities to Children in Street Situations (CISS).

A bench headed by Justice L Nageswara Rao said in addition to the request for approval under the CPS scheme, the state of Maharashtra shall also make an application to the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for approval for starting the open shelters.

The apex court also directed the Union of India to take a decision and grant its approval within a period of two months from the date of receipt of the application.

"The State of Maharashtra



is permitted to submit a proposal for starting 20 open shelters for the financial year 2022-2023 within a period of one week from today.

Union of India shall take a decision and grant its approval within a period of two months from the date of receipt of the application," the bench, also comprising justices B R Gavai and A S Bopanna, said in its May 19 order.

Covid jab reduces risk of death by 34%: Study

Even vaccinated people with mild breakthrough Covid-19 infections can experience debilitating, lingering symptoms that affect the heart, brain, lungs and other parts of the body, according to a study published in Nature Medicine.

The study of more than 13 million veterans also found that vaccination against the virus that causes Covid-19 reduced the risk of death by 34 per cent and the risk of getting long Covid by 15 per cent, compared with unvaccinated patients infected with the virus.

However, vaccines were shown to be most effective in preventing some of the most worrisome manifestations of long Covid — lung and blood-clotting disorders — which declined about 49 per cent and 56 per cent, respectively, among those who were vac-



nated. "Vaccinations remain critically important in the fight against Covid-19," said first author Ziyad Al-Aly, MD, a clinical epidemiologist at Washington University. "Vaccinations reduce the risk of hospitalization and dying from Covid-19. But vaccines seem to only provide modest protection against long Covid.

People recovering from breakthrough Covid-19 infection should continue to monitor their health and see a health-care provider if lingering symptoms make it difficult to carry out daily activities."

The researchers classified patients as fully vaccinated if

they had received two doses of the Moderna or Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines or one dose of the Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccine.

At the time the research was conducted, the database used for this study did not include information about whether patients received boosters.

"Now that we understand that Covid-19 can have lingering health consequences even among the vaccinated, we need to move toward developing mitigation strategies that can be implemented for the longer term since it does not appear that Covid-19 is going away any time soon," said Al-Aly, who is also the chief of research and development at the VA St. Louis Health Care System.

"We need to urgently develop and deploy additional layers of protection that could be sustainably implemented to reduce the risk of long Covid."

Desi survey ship Nirdeshak launched in Bay of Bengal

The indigenously designed and built survey ship Nirdeshak was launched on Thursday in the Bay of Bengal.

It is the second of the four survey vessels (Large) built by the public sector Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE), Kolkata in collaboration with Larsen and Toubro (L&T) for the Indian Navy.

Giving details of the ship, Navy officials said here, the vessel was launched at Kattupalli, Chennai. The ship made its first contact with water of Bay of Bengal at 1038 hrs at the launch ceremony graced by the Vice Admiral Biswajit Dasgupta, Flag Officer Commanding in Chief, Eastern Naval Command.

His wife Sarbani Dasgupta launched the ship in keeping with the naval tradition. The ship has taken its name from erstwhile Nirdeshak which was also an Indian Naval Survey ship and was decommissioned after 32 years of glorious service in December 2014.

Part construction of three out of four ships of survey vessels is being undertaken at L&T, Kattupalli as part of collaborative approach between GRSE and L&T shipbuilding.

This model of public private partnership shall be harbingers of future successful collaboration for warship construction in India, they said. The contract for building four ships was signed between defence ministry and GRSE in 2018.

The first of class ship 'Sandhayak' was launched on in December last year. The new survey ships will replace the existing Sandhayak Class survey ships with new generation hydrographic equipment to collect oceanographic data.

The Survey Vessel (Large) ships have a deep displacement of about 3,400 tons and a complement of 235 personnel. The



ship is designed to operate at cruise speed of 14 knots and maximum speed of 18 knots.

Bow and stern thrusters have been catered for better manoeuvring at low speeds required during shallow water survey operations.

The hull of these ships is made from indigenously developed DMR 249-A steel manufactured by Steel Authority of India Limited.

With a capability to carry four survey motor boats and an integral helicopter, the primary role of the ships would be to undertake full scale coastal and deep-water hydrographic surveys of ports and navigational channels.

The ships would also be deployed for collecting oceanographic and geophysical data for defence as well as civil applications.

In their secondary role, the ships are capable of providing limited defence, besides serving as hospital ships during emergencies.

Despite challenges due to COVID-19 pandemic, the GRSE has made substantial progress and aim to deliver Sandhayak, the first ship by January next year. The delivery of the second ship Nirdeshak is likely by April 2023.

Launch of the second survey vessel reinforces resolve for indigenous shipbuilding as part of the vision of 'Make in India', and 'Aatma Nirbhar Bharat'. The Survey Vessels Large will have over 80 per cent indigenous content by cost.

This will also ensure that large scale defence production is executed by Indian manufacturing units thereby generating employment and capability build up within country.

Major infiltration bid along LOC foiled

Security forces eliminate three Pak JeM terrorists in Kupwara

One Army porter succumbs to injuries

A joint team of security forces Thursday foiled a major infiltration bid along the Line of Control in North Kashmir district of Kupwara by eliminating three Pakistani terrorists belonging to Lashkar-e-Toiba outfit. One Indian Army porter, who had received injuries during the exchange of firing, succumbed to his injuries later in the hospital. So far the security forces have eliminated 26 foreign terrorists since January 1, 2022 while six of them have been gunned down in the last 24 hours. Out of these 14 belonged to JeM and 12 to LeT, official sources said.

Inspector General of Police, Kashmir range Vijay Kumar Thursday termed the



elimination of 03 Pakistani LeT terrorists as a big success and congratulated the joint forces for successive operations.

The security forces have also recovered arms & ammunition including 03 AK series rifles, 12 AK Magazines, 01 Pistol, 02 Pistol Magazines and 03 mobile phones from their possession.

According to a police spokesman, "based on a specific input developed by Kupwara Police regarding infiltration attempt of terrorists in village Jumagund near LoC area of Kupwara, an ambush was put in place by police and Army in the said area". As the infiltrat-

ing terrorists were intercepted by the joint party of Police & Army, they were challenged who in return fired indiscriminately upon joint party which was retaliated by the joint party leading to an encounter.

In the ensuing encounter, all the three infiltrated terrorists were killed. Based on the source report and as per the documents recovered from them, the killed terrorists have been identified as Pakistani LeT terrorists. Police spokesman said, One civilian porter namely Ab Lateef Mir S/o Majeed Mir resident of Kuchiban Jummagund, had received injuries during the firing and later succumbed to

injuries in hospital.

Meanwhile, ten locals, who were involved in anti-national sloganeering and stone-pelting outside Yasin Malik's house in the Maisuma area of Srinagar prior his verdict on a case related to terrorism and secessionist activities, have been arrested by the Srinagar police.

In a statement, police spokesman said a case vide FIR No. 10/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Maisuma and investigation was initiated. Accordingly, midnight raids were conducted at many places that led to the arrest of 10 accused persons including the key accused involved in the commission of crime. However, other accused persons involved in the commission of crime are being identified and will be booked soon under relevant law. Police spokesman maintained no attempt of creating law & order situation in the valley will be tolerated and all mischievous attempts of provoking law & order situation by vested interests will be treated with full force of law.

Yogi: Focus on self-reliance, overall development of UP

FM Khanna tables ₹6.15 L-cr budget for State

Uttar Pradesh Finance Minister Suresh Kumar Khanna tabled the over Rs 6.15 lakh crore budget of the Yogi Adityanath Government 2.0 in the UP Assembly on Thursday.

Before being tabled in the House, the budget was passed at a Cabinet meeting chaired by the Chief Minister at his official residence on Thursday morning.

The Rs 6,15,518.97 crore budget for 2022-23 fiscal has a provision of Rs 39,181.10 crore for new schemes. In the last 2021-22 fiscal, the Yogi government had presented a budget of Rs 5,50,270.78 crore.

Soon after the budget was tabled in the House, Chief

Minister Yogi Adityanath tweeted, "The latest budget is focused on ensuring self-reliance in the State."

Yogi Adityanath promised that the budget would be dedicated to the overall development of Uttar Pradesh.

"The economy of the state is improving rapidly. We believe that we will be successful in taking the state's economy to \$1 trillion," the Finance Minister Suresh Khanna said while tabling the budget.

Seated next to the chief minister in the assembly, Khanna said that Rs 276.66 crore had been proposed for Uttar Pradesh Special Security Force entrusted with the task of securing courts and historical and religious places, including Ayodhya, Kashi and Mathura.

For the Police Emergency Management System, the finance minister said that the second phase of the 112 scheme would start in this fiscal and a provision of Rs 730.88 crore had been proposed for strengthening it.

"For women, the budget has proposed setting up of cyber help desks at district

level and a provision of Rs 72.50 crore has been made for women empowerment schemes. A provision of Rs 20 crore has also been proposed for safety and empowerment of women and their skill development under Mission Shakti in micro and small scale industries sector," he added.

The finance minister informed the House, "The budget has proposed Rs 650 crore under farmers' accident scheme and there is a provision to provide a maximum of Rs 5 lakh in case of accidental death/disability of farmers under the scheme. A total of 15,000 solar pumps will be set up in 2022-23 fiscal and 60.20 lakh quintal seeds are proposed to be distributed to farmers. A target to distribute 119.30 lakh metric tons of fertilisers has also been proposed. A provision of Rs 1,000 crore is proposed for the Chief Minister's Minor Irrigation Scheme."

Khanna further said, "Free tablets and smartphones scheme for the youth was started in December 2021 and till now approximately 12 lakh tablets /smart phones have

been distributed. As per the Bharatiya Janata Party's Lok Kalyan Sankalp Patra, two crore smart phones/tablets are to be distributed to the youth in the next five years. Besides, Rs 1,500 crore has been proposed in the budget for Swami Vivekananda Youth Empowerment Scheme."

"Also, to promote entrepreneurship and innovation in various fields among youth, under the new UP Start-up Policy-2020, a target to establish a total of 100 incubators and 10,000 startups in the next five years has been set. With the objective of providing coaching to students preparing for competitions near their homes, Chief Minister Abhyudaya Yojana has been implemented by the government in all divisional headquarters, which is now being expanded to all districts of the state and a provision of Rs 30 crore is proposed for the it," the minister said.

Khanna further said that a provision of Rs 10 crore had been proposed to provide financial assistance to young lawyers for purchasing books and magazines for the first three years of work.

Centre reports 18% fall in road accidents

In a major respite, the Centre on Thursday reported there has been a sharp decline in the road accidents parameters in the years 2020 when compared to years 2019. The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH) informed that over the previous year's average, total road accidents decreased on an average by 18.46 per cent, whereas the number of persons killed too decreased by 12.84 percent and the number of injuries decreased by 22.84 percent.

According to the report 'Road accidents in India — 2020', prepared by the Transport Research Wing (TRW) of the MoRTH, the number of road accidents has been on a decline since 2016 except for a marginal increase of 0.46 percent in 2018. For the second consecutive year, the total number of road accident fatalities has declined in 2020. Similarly, the number of persons injured has been on the decline since 2015.



"A total of 3,66,138 road accidents have been reported by States and Union Territories (UTs) during the calendar year 2020, which claimed 1,31,714 lives and caused 3, 48,279 injuries," said a Press statement by MoRTH.

As per the report, there has also been a decline in the number of fatal accidents, i.e., accidents involving at least one death. A total of 1, 20,806 fatal accidents were reported in 2020, which is 12.23 percent lower than the 2019 figure of 1, 37,689. Interestingly, during 2020, National Highways, State Highways and Other Roads reported a smaller number of accidents, fatalities, and injuries

as compared to the previous year.

"For the third consecutive year in 2020, the fatal road accident victims largely constitute young people in the productive age groups. Young adults in the age group of 18 - 45 years accounted for 69 percent of victims during 2020. People in the working age group of 18 - 60 years share 87.4 percent of total road accident fatalities," said the official release.

The Major States that achieved a significant reduction in road accidents in 2020 are Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Karnataka. And the major States that achieved a significant reduction in road accident

fatalities in 2020 are Tamil Nadu, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Andhra Pradesh.

"The overall reduction in road crash deaths is driven by the decline in road crash deaths during the months of April and May, which overlapped with the period when the country was under CoVID-19 induced lockdown. During 2020, many states notified provisions of the Motor Vehicles Amendment Act, and some marginal decrease in the first quarter of 2020 can be attributed to that. However, it's too early to say if the implementation of the legislation has led to a decline in road crash deaths in 2020. Perhaps 2021 data shall provide more insights into the effectiveness of the implementation of the legislation, if at all," said Piyush Tewari, Founder and CEO, SaveLIFE Foundation, that has associated itself with the MoRTH and other road stakeholders to do conduct studies and research on road accidents and preventive measures.

Bengal to swap Guv with Didi as Chancellor of universities

In a new twist to the perennial run-ins between the Raj Bhavan and Nabanna (State secretariat) the Bengal Government on Thursday decided to replace Governor Jagdeep Dhankhar with Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee as the chancellor of the State-run universities.

The decision was taken in a hurriedly called Cabinet meeting on Thursday noon, sources said adding after the Cabinet decision the Government will now amend the existing law and get the Bill passed in the State Assembly.

State Education Minister Bratya Basu said that the "Cabinet has unanimously passed a resolution to replace the Governor with the Chief Minister as the chancellor of all the state-run universities ... now a Bill to this effect will be place in the Assembly and the law will be amended."

Though the Minister would not dwell on any possible alternative measure should the Governor refuse to sign the Bill, another senior minister said "the Government has the option of sending it for the presidential assent or pass an ordinance to that effect." The second option was more likely he hinted.

Basu had in an earlier statement said that "if the Governor continues not to cooperate with the Government ... by sitting on the files the Government will have no option but to replace him with the Chief Minister so that academic process does not get hampered due to political reasons."

The ruling Trinamool Congress has often attacked the Raj Bhavan calling it a BJP office and the Governor an "agent of the BJP." The Governor on the other hand had alleged that the State had appointed about 25 Vice

Chancellors illegally without taking the consent of the Raj Bhavan and that at the instance of the State Government the V-Cs do not come to attend the meetings called by him.

There was uproar both in the civil and political society soon after the Cabinet decision with opposition BJP calling the decision an attempt to usurp even the academia. "After having extend its sway in all the departments ... after having devoured everything the Government now wants to usurp higher education," said BJP leader Samik Bhattacharya.

Another BJP leader and former MP Anupam Hazra said that "the way the Chief Minister is taking her decisions would have made even Muhammad bin Tughlaq feel threatened too ... today she telling that she is the Chancellor ... tomorrow she will say that she is the Prime Minister of Bengal."

₹100 cr earmarked to make Maha Kumbh a grand event

PC George sent to jail for 'hate speech'

PC George, a seven-term MLA of Kerala Legislative Assembly, was sent to Thiruvananthapuram District Jail on Thursday as the Judicial Magistrate cancelled the bail granted to the former on May 1 for the Ananthapuri Hindu Mahasammelan Speech at Thiruvananthapuram which the police described as hate speech.

George, a maverick politician, is the lone senior leader from the non-BJP parties to caution the people about the increasing instances of inter-caste marriages happening between Hindu girls and Muslim youth in the State. He was very critical of the Halal food controversy and had asked all those who do not subscribe to the Quranic concept to stay away from establishments sell-

ing Halal products.

A Bench of the Kerala High Court that was to consider the plea for regular bail filed by George on Thursday postponed the hearing to Friday. George was held by the Police on Wednesday evening when he had gone to the Kochi City Police Commissioner for questioning in connection with another hate speech made by him at Ernakulam. While the interrogation was in progress, the Thiruvananthapuram Judicial Magistrate issued an order cancelling the conditional bail granted him by the Judicial Court on May 1.

The arrest of George is seen as a sign of Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan cracking the whip on political leaders resorting to hate speeches in the backdrop of the bye-election scheduled from assembly con-

stituency on May 31. The Congress, the CPI(M) and the BJP are trying to wrest the seat. Vijayan is leading the election campaign from the front and has stayed put in Thrikkakkara. All LDF ministers and MLAs too are working round-the-clock for the victory of Dr Joe Joseph.

The Chief Minister took time off from the hectic campaign at Thrikkakkara on Thursday to meet the victim of the 2017 rape and assault case as she had approached the High Court with allegations that some CPI(M) leaders were hand in glove with the main accused, Dileep and the trial court was out to derail the trial process. Vijayan later told reporters that the victim is fully satisfied with the investigation carried out by the State Police.

Four Congress leaders, including Chidambaram, in race for lone RS seat DMK has allocated to party

Four prominent Congress leaders from Tamil Nadu are the front runners for the lone Rajiya Sabha seat which the DMK had allocated to the party. Six seats are at stake from the State in the poll scheduled for June 10. Going by the current party position in the Legislative Assembly, the ruling DMK will have a cake walk in winning four seats while the Opposition AIADMK would win two.

The DMK has allotted one seat from its kitty to the Congress. According to a senior TNCC leader, P

Chidambaram, former finance and home minister, K S Azhagiri (TN chief of the party), Viswanathan (former MP who had represented Kancheepuram Parliamentary Constituency) and C D Meyyappan, AICC leader and former president of the Tamil Nadu unit of the Youth Congress are the front runners for the lone seat.

Chidambaram, the party ideologist and main think tank is the senior leader from the State. "But his statement that a veshti wearing Congress leader would become the PM has not been taken seriously by the party high command", said a party veteran.

8 yrs of BJP rule marks darkest chapter: TMC

The Trinamool Congress on Thursday hit out at the BJP Government for "navigating India towards complete darkness." In a tweeted video the party said that the eight years of Narendra Modi Government had given nothing but all-round failure. "The eight year of BJP rule can be explained in terms of acute price rise, unem-

ployment, falling rupee, crippling economy, intolerance and injustice," the video said.

Explaining the contents of the tweeted video party spokesperson Kunal Ghosh said that the "eight years of BJP rule is nothing but an eight-year-bluff ... an eight year jumla ... they came promising acchhe din (good old days) they gave us inflation, social despondency, intolerance ...

Prime Minister Modi's eight years in power is the darkest chapter of Indian history post Independence."

The right to life of the people has been hit by the anti-people policy of the Government he said. "The bank interests are down, prices are high with acute unemployment ... the citizens of India had never felt so threatened ever," he said.

ED raids Sena Minister Parab's multiple premises

In a major jolt to the ruling Shiv Sena in Maharashtra, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Thursday raided multiple locations belonging to State Transport Minister and senior party leader Anil Parab, a close aide of Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, in Mumbai, Pune and Ratnagiri in an alleged money laundering case.

Fifty-seven-year-old Parab himself was at Ajinkyatara, his official bungalow in Mumbai, when the ED officials carried out the searches.

The simultaneous raids on seven premises belonging to Parab in a simultaneous operation that lasted for 12-long hours. The ED officials began their raids at 6 am. Among other places they raided since morning were Parab's official residence 'Ajinkyatara' in south Mumbai, his private residence, the residence of his close associate at Kothrud in Pune with whom the minister had financial dealings.

Among the places where raids were conducted included Ratnagiri town and Dapoli, a hill station in Ratnagiri district

where the minister has constructed a holiday resort.

After the arrest of two ruling Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) ministers - Nawab Malik and Anil Deshmukh - both of the NCP, Parab is the third State minister to come under the scanner of the ED. Earlier, State Ministers Anil Deshmukh and Nawab Malik were arrested November 2, 2021 and February 23, 2022 in two separate money laundering cases. Deshmukh and Malik are currently behind the bars..

The ED has booked Parab under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

Considered close to Thackerays for a few decades, Para is a lawyer. He played a role in the formation of the Maha Vikas Aghadi government in November 2019. It was at Parab's suggestion that Aaditya Thackeray contested the Worli seat during the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly polls

Though the specific details of the raids were not yet known, official sources said that the ED was investigating, the allegations include purchase of a parcel of land in Dapoli by Parab in 2017 for a consideration of Rs

1 crore.

The ED had summoned Parab on August 29, 2021 in connection with allegations of corruption made against him by the incarcerated police officer Sachin Vaze.

It may be recalled that in a four-page hand written letter to the Special Judge of the NIA court on April 7, 2021 Vaze - who is currently in the central investigating agency's custody in the twin SUV planting and alleged Manshukh Hiran murder cases - had claimed that Parab had called him July-August, 2020 to his official bungalow and look into a complaint concerning the Saifee Burhani Upliftment Trust (SBUT), which was under preliminary enquiry and asked him to bring the SBUT trustees to him for negotiations about the enquiry.

"He (Parab) also insisted to initiate primary talks to get Rs.50 crore from the SBUT in order to close the said enquiry. I had expressed my inability to do any such things as I do not know anyone from the SBUT and also I did not have any control over the enquiry," Vaze contended in his letter.

Rule of the gun

The Robb Elementary School carnage again raises the issue of gunman fetish among America's youth

The American myth is turning on itself. Pet phrases, like the "world's policeman" or the post-9/11 "world's soldier", are boomeranging. A larger-than-life portrayal of the American Marine in Hollywood and addictive video games has acquired bloody connotations. The American "Special Operator", who is the quintessential symbol of the "American way of life", is the latest Frankenstein. And, it is now happening in Texas, the land of the self-claimed frontiersmen, those buccaneers who still wear cowboy hats and boots and ride horses, the guns and rifles and repeaters completing their macho image. The latest incident of mass killings in Uvalde, Texas, on Tuesday gives Americans a long-overdue wake-up call: The previous mass killers were labelled as Islamist jihadists, white supremacists or right-wing local terrorists. Today's American killer is nothing of that sort. Mostly male, he is an ordinary citizen with a neighbourly attitude that hides the ghosts of penury or social ostracism, a generally wasted life or a pitifully impaired mental status. The killer, ashamed of his situation, decides to get justice the only way he knows: By the gun. But first, the would-be killer has to get into the role. He chooses the image that hits him from every TV screen, chewing gum wrapper, muscle-building whey tin, and film, in fact from every advertisement in the US: the macho, gun-toting American vigilante. So, he acquires the tactical battle uniform including the hat, vest, gloves and cargo trousers, the toughest 'costume' Americans like him swear by.

Slipping into abyss

Kerala is experiencing one blow after another in the LDF Government's second term in office

Swami Vivekananda, during his tour to Kerala in 1892, had described the province as a "lunatic asylum" as he was shocked by the vacuous communalism. The Kerala of 2022 needs an epithet stronger than what the renowned monk had used. Despite democratically electing India's first Communist Government and being a social, economic and educational model for the country, the State often spawns communal battle cries, threats and one-upmanship among religious leaders and organisations which even the Kerala High Court has described as "terrorist outfits". The threats and challenges touched a new high as a 10-year-old boy was used by the activists of Popular Front of India, an Islamic outfit, to raise slogans against Hindus and Christians. Though the slogans raised during a Republic Rally at Alappuzha last Saturday are not fit to print, it can be said that these were a blot on Kerala's psyche. Political murders, dowry deaths, student violence and drug trafficking have become regular features in the State's daily life. The CPI(M)-led Left Democratic Front Government under Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan, which retained power in the 2021 election, is clueless or suffering from selective amnesia since it assumed office last May.



This is the first time in four decades that a Government succeeded in retaining power for the second term in Kerala. Despite making a lot of sound and fury, Vijayan's second innings stands out because of its indifference to burning issues. Another news that shook Kerala's conscience pertains to a rape survivor who approached the Kerala High Court with the charge that the trial court has a hidden agenda to derail her case. The victim, herself a popular actress, had named Malayalam cinema's top actor Dileep as the prime accused in the 2017 case in which the latter hired a petty thief to rape the woman. A series of dowry deaths reported from various parts of the State has caused anguish in the mind of Governor Arif Mohammed Khan, who staged a day's fast as a mark of solidarity with the victims. Nothing is going right to date in the second tenure of the LDF Government. Meanwhile, the Chief Minister and his party colleagues accusing the rape survivor of playing politics has further shocked women in the State. Kerala deserves a much better deal than this sexist approach.

Upshot, prospects of Biden's Asia policy

There are several reasons why the Biden Administration's efforts to infuse a new movement in the ties with Asean assume huge significance

Amid a gloomy picture of the world order due to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, President Joe Biden has redirected his attention to deepening and consolidating America's ties with its allies and partners in Asia. In this context, the US hosted Asean leaders for a special summit on May 12-13 to take stock of its relationships. Biden paid a five-day visit to South Korea and Japan during May 20-24, launching a mega-regional economic plan for the Indo-Pacific.

While commemorating the 45 years of US-Asean relations, Biden declared the beginning of a new era in their relations. He argued that "a great deal of history of our world in the next 50 years is going to be written and the Asean countries and our relationship with you is the future in the coming years and decades". Undoubtedly, there are several reasons why the Biden Administration's political and others efforts to infuse a new movement in the ties with Asean assume huge significance. Of course, one factor that has dominated the US pivot to Southeast Asia is China's increasing footprints in the region through the Belt & Road Initiative, the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership.

Therefore, to contain China's influence and maintain its permeance in the region, it is imperative for the US to accelerate the level of cooperation with Asean. On the other hand, Asean countries have become alarmed at China's assertive posturing in the South China Sea. Consequently, they not only want strong American military presence in the region, but are also trying to increase trade and commerce with the US to reduce their economic dependability on China.

Sadly, President Donald Trump's unpredictable behaviour, the absence of Asean centrality in the Indo-Pacific strategy, the US withdrawal from the Trans-Pacific Trade Agreement created huge distrust among



Asean countries about the US' desire to invest in the relationship. The Biden Administration's decision to withdraw from Afghanistan, the initial ambiguity in its approach towards Russia's invasion of Ukraine and other issues only compounded Asean's apprehensions about the future direction of the relationship.

Expectedly, the special summit addressed certain critical issues of Southeast Asian countries. One, the US reiterated that its Indo-Pacific strategy will be Asean-centric. This acknowledgment was important because Asean has generated the concern that the US Indo-Pacific strategy will dilute its position in US policy towards Asia. Two, Biden also announced to invest \$150 million in new projects to bolster Southeast Asia's climate, maritime and public health infrastructure. Three, Asean countries, except Singapore, have adopted the policy of neutrality on Russia's invasion of Ukraine. This in turn signalled the decline of US influence in the region. Thus, before starting his Asia tour, Biden wanted to

send a message to Russia and China through the Special Summit that the US continues to enjoy close ties with Southeast Asian countries. At the same time, though the joint statement issued after the Summit did not mention the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Biden must have reportedly asked Asean members to take a tough stand on the Russia-Ukraine war.

On the other hand, during his Asia visit, the launch of Indo-Pacific Economic Framework during the second in-person QUAD Summit emerged as a major development. Ever since the reemergence of QUAD in 2017, formally known as Quadrilateral Security Dialogue, it has made huge progress. This can be gauged from the fact that the QUAD meeting was initially held at the junior bureaucratic level. Now, it is organised at different levels, including the heads of State. While QUAD has played a pivotal role in dealing with the COVID virus, the group has become the anchor of promoting a free, open, prosperous and secure

Indo-Pacific. Addressing an overdue lacuna in the Indo-Pacific strategy, QUAD has launched Indo-Pacific Economic Framework. In turn, it will play a crucial role in limiting China's economic clout in the region.

Earlier, QUAD had shown hesitation in adding security issues to its priority. However, the launch of an Indo-Pacific Partnership for Maritime Domain Awareness (IPMDA) has indicated the willingness of the QUAD countries to foster security cooperation. The IPMDA will offer a near-real-time, integrated and cost-effective maritime domain awareness picture and help Quad members' allies as well to fully monitor their shores.

Of course, Taiwan appeared as a major issue on the priority list of Biden's visit to Asia. In fact, he said in no uncertain terms that the US would intervene militarily if Taiwan came under Chinese attack. This strong presidential statement, with the presence of the major Asian powers in Tokyo, certainly assumes huge importance, indicating the possible shift in the US' approach towards 'One China' policy. Thus, while the visit has crystallised the Biden Administration's readiness to lead the regional and global efforts to contain autocratic tendencies in Asia and beyond, it needs to be realised that the success of the Indo-Pacific strategy and QUAD singularly dependents on whether the US and other powers can protect Taiwan's independence or not.

Thus, while the US has indicated to end the policy of ambiguity on Taiwan, global and regional efforts must be channelised to make Taiwan an integral element of the Indo-Pacific Strategy and QUAD.

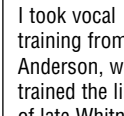

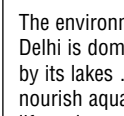

QUAD LEADERS' SUMMIT OUTCOMES FOR FUTURE

Maritime data sharing provides weather and waterway watch

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was in Tokyo for the second in-person QUAD leaders' summit. He had bilateral discussions with Prime ministers of Japan and Australia and US President Joe Biden. It underscores the importance of the Indo-Pacific as the external strategy of the QUAD members. The apprehensions regarding the US losing focus on this crucial region due to Ukraine stand resolved. This group of 4 nations, though not a military alliance, shares common threat perceptions from China. Australia had pulled out from the group in 2007 as it was then in a tight embrace with China. However, an aggressive China in Australia's backyard, used military power to expand its territorial controls, forcing the Australians to get back into QUAD. The Tokyo summit saw a mint-fresh Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese attending the meeting in person along with his foreign minister. The QUAD political leaders expanded on their targets they had set out in their meetings since March 2021. One important outcome was announcement of Indo-Pacific Partnership for Maritime Domain Awareness (IPMDA). In a statement, the White House elaborated that IPMDA would provide for "faster, wider, and more accurate maritime picture of near-real-time activities in partners' waters. This common operating picture will integrate three critical regions-the Pacific Islands, Southeast Asia, and the Indian Ocean region-in the Indo-Pacific." Earlier a senior US administration official



had highlighted that maritime arrangement will allow countries "The ability to know what is happening in countries' territorial waters and in their exclusive economic zones." This cooperation could be one of the most significant outcomes from QUAD so far as it brings together all the QUAD partner countries together to share the data they collect individually about their maritime resources and far away islands and get a big picture. This data sharing could lead to early warnings for disasters, climate change incidents and most important be the eyes at the largest waterway in the world. It will keep an eye on illegal military interventions, illegal fishing activities and potentially criminal activities using the sea route. The QUAD leaders were categorical in stating the purpose as nonmilitary but at a level of sharing surveillance data amongst the coast guards. Any analyst would be able to pinpoint the actual reason behind this initiative is to contain China's aggressive illegal occupations and economic activities in many of the islands in the Indo Pacific region.

It is a shared concern for India, Australia and Japan. However, increasingly it has been a major issue of conflict for several countries in South and Southeast Asia which have felt bullied by China. The QUAD decision to make the shared data "unclassified" and therefore open for any country in the region, makes IPMDA an inclusive framework. The focus is on identification and working on cutting edge future technologies to collect the data and make it most meaningful for users. This could make QUAD a unique partner for many countries in the region, as they could fall back on QUAD data and intelligence for securing their maritime economic interests and prevent criminal activities in their backyard. Another key aspect of the recently concluded QUAD summit was the focus on cyber security vulnerabilities faced by each nation and sharing of information between the Computer Emergency Response Teams (CERT). It was also stated that "the Quad will improve software and Managed Service Provider (MSP) security by coordinating cyber security standards for Quad Governments' procurement of software." This should create a common framework for governments in each of the 4 nations to be effective in case of cyber-attacks on their critical infrastructure.

Arson exposes violent social underbelly of Konaseema

The violence was the result of longstanding community rivalries and discontent with the Govt rather than antagonism towards Ambedkar

What happened in Konaseema district in Andhra Pradesh on May 24 was unprecedented and totally unforeseen. Houses of a Minister for Transport, Pinipe Viswaroop, a Dalit, and MLA, P. Satish, a fisherman, were set on fire by a mob which also indulged in arson and vandalism in Amalapuram town. Violence broke out when the police attempted to prevent a procession taken out by Joint Action Committee (JAC) as part of 'Chalo Amalapuram' from meeting the district collector. Had the police allowed the protestors to submit their memorandum to the collector, things might have been different.

The JAC was formed to oppose the change of the district's name from Konaseema to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Konaseema

District. People of Konaseema are sentimental about the name of their district. The movement for a separate district of Konaseema was on for many years. It acquired momentum with the State Government's decision to create Konaseema district and to add Ambedkar's name to it. Top leaders of major parties supported the proposal though many others, transcending party differences, privately opposed the change. Nara Chandrababu Naidu of the TDP and Pawan Kalyan of the Jana Sena Party gave their consent when YSRCP government sought their approval.

Konaseema district has a peculiar demographic picture. Kapus, Settibalijs as and Dalits are the three dominant communities which are equally large, vocal and militant. There



used to be frequent clashes between the Kapus and Settibalijs as till 1993 when some leaders such as Gudipudi Prabhakara Rao brokered peace between the two warring communities. The two communities have not been quarreling ever since barring some isolated incidents. However, the Dalits have been at loggerheads both with the Kapus and

Settibalijs as who are part of the BCs. Konaseema district has one Lok Sabha seat (Amalapuram) and three (out of a total of seven) assembly seats reserved for SCs. Anuradha, an SC, is representing Amalapuram constituency in Lok Sabha. The Minister from the district Viswaroop is considered very close to YSR's family. Dalits are in command in the district and this is detested by Kapus and Balijs.

When AP Chief Minister Jagan Mohan Reddy visited Marumalla village near Amalapuram last week, Viswaroop had taken a delegation of Dalits to him. They submitted a memorandum requesting the Chief Minister to name Konaseema district after Baba Saheb Ambedkar. Jagan Mohan Reddy accepted

the request but wanted the opposition parties to approve the proposal. TDP and JSP leaders had welcomed the idea. A gazette notification was issued last week renaming the district as Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Konaseema District and it asked the people to let the government know within one month if anybody has any objection.

The GO was not openly opposed by any noted political leader. But WhatsApp messages were sent in their thousands by the general public, supporting or opposing the move. The Dalit protagonists were as aggressive as Kapus and Balijs. Viswaroop reportedly told the police to use force in dealing with the situation. The police had clamped Section 144 and Section 30 by way of preventive

measures. But the force which the protestors unleashed in a matter of hours was not foreseen by the police who were unprepared. They used lathis and fired in the air for five times to control the mob. Till 8 pm the street battles between the police and the protestors were going on. The police could bring the situation under control by late in the night. DIG Palraju (Eluru range) and four SPs have been camping at Amalapuram which remained peaceful on Wednesday. Extra forces have been rushed to the town. Forty-six persons have been taken into custody till Wednesday afternoon, according to DIG Palraju. He had spoken to community leaders. He appealed to the people to maintain peace and harmony. Konaseema which is

known for its greenery, coconut trees and high yielding crops, has all of a sudden exploded in the face of the police officials. Nothing of this sort had happened in the last four decades. Even at the time of Vangaveeti Mohan Ranga's murder in Vijayawada in 1989, the riots were all over coastal Andhra and only Kapus in Konaseema were involved in sporadic violence.

This time it was SCs versus all others. It was mostly the result of long-standing community rivalries and discontent with the present Government rather than antagonism towards Ambedkar. The dominant profile of Dalit leaders also added fuel to the fire. Former Speaker of Lok Sabha, GMC Balayogi, hailed from the same place.

The world must unite for fighting inflation

To control inflation, decisions of all Central banks need some kind of real-time coordination, a mechanism for which needs to be worked out and activated

It seems that for the entire world, high inflation is going to be the new normal, at least for the foreseeable future. In April 2022, the IMF's World Economic Outlook predicted that during 2022, inflation will be at 5.7 percent in advanced economies and 8.7 percent in emerging markets and developing economies-1.8 and 2.8 percent higher, respectively, than its earlier projections in January. The unprecedented supply disruptions caused by the Russia-Ukraine War, now about to enter its fourth month, have been driving commodity prices for quite some time, and conditions are expected to deteriorate progressively.

Worsening supply-demand imbalances and further increases in commodity prices could lead to persistently high inflation at least in the medium term, which in turn would lead to a spiral of rising interest rates, higher wage demands and consequent fall in the profitability of companies forcing them to curtail production, leading in turn to still higher inflation and more losses in real wages. Post-pandemic, the world is already struggling for economic recovery while trying to manage much higher debt levels than before due to the expansionary fiscal policies triggered by the pandemic. Now the higher inflation would expose countries, especially the emerging markets and developing economies, to serious debt vulnerabilities, let alone building fiscal buffers.

The drivers of this rising inflation - the war, sanctions, lockdown in China due to a resurgence of Covid, and the massive supply-chain disruptions as a result of all these — are beyond the control of central banks. Hence monetary policies alone may not suffice to tame the menace of inflation, though the responses of different countries to such policies would vary depending on their conditions and the strength of their fundamentals. Governments would also be weary of reversing their expansionary fiscal policies which would translate into economic hardships for their people trying hard to recover from the losses suffered during the pandemic years. In the unfolding scenario, growth will likely take a back seat for the entire world for the time being.

In India, the retail inflation measured by the CPI had shot up to 7.8 percent in April 2022 from 7 percent in March, the highest in the last 8 years. While the urban inflation was 7.1 percent, the rural inflation soared to 8.4 percent. In the CPI basket, food and beverages carry a weightage of 45.9 percent and fuel another 6.8 percent; even if we take these out, the core inflation still remained at 6.5 percent, way above the RBI's inflation target of 6 percent at the upper band. Factory output also remained sluggish, with the index of industrial production (IIP) rising only by 1.9 percent in March 2022, down from the peak of 134.4 percent recorded in April 2021, mainly due to the low performance

of the manufacturing sector which has been hit hard by rising input prices and supply disruptions.

A part of the inflation is also imported, since more than 80 percent of our fuel and 60 percent of edible oil are imported from countries which are also facing severe inflation, and the inflated import bill is reducing our foreign exchange reserves which have come down to US\$ 598 billion providing an import cover of about 11 months in April 2022, from US\$ 635 billion in January 2022. The inflation figures are already exceeding 9 percent in certain states like West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and Telangana. The optimism of the Union Finance Ministry that the gradual recovery of aggregate demand was reducing the risk of sustained high inflation may be rather misplaced. Even the higher collection of GST as seen in the recent months may also be partly fuelled by the rise in prices of commodities rather than due to the expansion of economic activities.

Following the US Fed's 0.5 percent hike in inflation, the RBI has increased the repo rate as well as the CRR by 0.4 percent on 4th May. It is widely expected that there would be another steep hike in both the interest rate as well as the CRR in June. CRISIL Ratings has projected inflation to be around 6.3 percent for the current fiscal; it also expects the RBI to raise repo rates by another 0.75 percent to one percent during FY-2023. Economists and corpo-

rate leaders expect the interest rate to finally settle down around 5.5 percent by the mid FY-2023. Indeed, given the huge difference between the repo rate of 4.4 percent and the yield of 10-year G-Sec at above 7 percent which is a benchmark for interest rate in the economy, there is scope for still higher increases. But every increase in interest rate contracts the space for fiscal manoeuvrability of the government and growth becomes the ultimate casualty. Already the growth forecasts for India have been sliced by all agencies - RBI has itself lowered its growth protection to 7.2 percent in 2022-23, down from 7.8 percent it had earlier estimated.

The wholesale inflation measured by the WPI has been much higher than the CPI inflation throughout - it rose to a four-month high of 14.55 percent in March 2022 from 13.11 percent in February. Prices accelerated across all segments - 10.71 percent for manufactured products, 25.97 percent for basic metals, 34.52 percent for fuel and power, and 15.54 percent for primary articles, despite a marginal slowdown in the cost of food articles. On a monthly basis, wholesale prices increased by 2.69 percent in March, the most since the series began in 2004. The reason for such divergence between the WPI and CPI is partly due to the different weightages in their respective baskets - in the WPI basket, manufactured articles get 64.2 percent weightage which is much higher than in the CPI,

whereas primary articles get 22.6 percentage weightage, followed by 13.2 percent for fuel and power.

While the RBI considers retail inflation for its policy decisions, the wholesale price rises ultimately get reflected on the retail prices after a lag of a few quarters as companies tend pass on the burden to consumers. Thus, the high WPI inflation in March for primary articles is likely to get translated into still higher food prices which will affect the poor more than the rich, again belying the Finance Ministry's assumption that at the lower end of the economic strata, the impact of inflation is not as deep as at the upper end.

It is really strange why the RBI took so long to act and when it finally did so, why it had to act in such an abrupt manner that was sure to jolt the market severely, leading to panic selling by foreign investors leading to sustained mayhem in the stock market and severe erosion in the value of the rupee. The increase in interest rates could have been affected in a little more predictable manner, using the mechanism of regular MPC meetings. If inflation is to be controlled, decisions by all central banks need some kind of a real-time coordination, a mechanism for which needs to be worked out and activated without delay. The WTO, must also be involved simultaneously in the battle against inflation. Inflation is as bad as Covid if not worse, and only by coming together, the world can fight it effectively.

Ex-Lankan PM questioned by CID over May 9 violence

The Sri Lankan police have questioned former prime minister Mahinda Rajapaksa and recorded a 3-hour-long statement over the violent clashes between his supporters and anti-government protesters in the crisis-hit country that killed at least 10 people and injured over 200 others, according to a media report on Thursday.

On May 9, violence erupted in Sri Lanka after supporters of the 76-year-old former premier attacked peaceful anti-government protesters demanding his ouster over the country's worst economic crisis that led to acute shortages of staple food, fuel and power.

Over 200 people have also been injured in the violence in Colombo and other cities.

The Criminal Investigations Department (CID) has recorded a statement from Mahinda Rajapaksa on Wednesday over May 9 incidents at Kollupitiya and Galle Face Green, the official residence of the Sri



Lankan prime minister, the Daily Mirror website reported.

Police said the CID recorded a nearly three-hour-long statement from the former Prime Minister last evening at his residence in Colombo, the report added.

On May 23, a top bureaucrat of Sri Lanka's Ministry of Security who is in charge of

the police department resigned over his failure to curb the violent clashes.

Last week, Sri Lanka's CID also quizzed three members of the ruling SLPP parliamentary group over their alleged involvement in the clashes.

Two of their colleagues who were arrested previously have been remanded in cus-

tody till May 25.

On Friday, Namal Rajapaksa, a former minister and the son of Mahinda Rajapaksa also summoned and his statement was recorded.

Members of the ruling coalition government blamed Opposition party Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna for instigating the violence on May 9,

which was vehemently denied by the Marxist party.

The mob destroyed several tents and other structures erected at Galle Face and also attacked some of the demonstrators.

The violence saw arson attacks on the homes of several politicians, including the ancestral home of the Rajapaksas in Hambantota.

The properties of some 78 government parliamentarians faced arson in the ensuing attacks.

Sri Lanka has been witnessing large-scale protests against the government's handling of the debt-ridden economy -- the worst-ever economic crisis in the country's history.

The country of 22 million is grappling with unprecedented economic turmoil since its independence from Britain in 1948.

The crisis is caused in part by a lack of foreign currency, which has meant that the country cannot afford to pay for imports of staple foods and fuel, leading to acute shortages and very high prices.

Russia takes steps to bolster army, tighten grip on Ukraine

President Vladimir Putin issued an order ON Wednesday to fast track Russian citizenship for residents in parts of southern Ukraine largely held by his forces, while lawmakers in Moscow passed a bill to strengthen the stretched Russian army.

Putin's decree applying to the Kherson and Zaporizhzhia regions could allow Russia to strengthen its hold on territory that lies between eastern Ukraine, where Moscow-backed separatists occupy some areas, and the Crimean Peninsula, which Russia seized in 2014.

The Russian army is engaged in an intense battle for Ukraine's eastern industrial heartland, known as the Donbas. In a sign that the Kremlin is trying to bolster its stretched military machine, Russian lawmakers agreed to scrap the age limit of 40 for individuals signing their first voluntary military contracts.

A description of the bill on the parliament website indicated older recruits would be allowed to operate precision weapons or serve in engineering or medical roles. The chair of the Russian parliament's



defense committee, Andrei Kartapolov, said the measure would make it easier to hire people with "in-demand" skills.

Russian authorities have said that only volunteer contract soldiers are sent to fight in Ukraine, although they have acknowledged that some conscripts were drawn into the fighting by mistake in the early stages of the war.

Three months into Russia's invasion of the neighboring country, Putin visited a military hospital in Moscow and met with some soldiers wounded in Ukraine, the Kremlin said in a statement on its website.

Wednesday's event was the Russian leader's first publicly known visit with soldiers fighting in Ukraine since he

launched the war on Feb. 24. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has visited wounded soldiers, civilians and children — including at times when Russian troops were fighting on the outskirts of Kyiv.

A reporter for the state-run Russia TV channel posted a video clip on Telegram showing Putin in a white medical coat talking to a man in hospital attire, presumably a soldier. The man, filmed from behind standing up and with no visible wounds, tells Putin that he has a son. The president, accompanied by Defense Minister Sergei Shoigu, responds: "He will be proud of his father," before shaking the man's hand.

China's Foreign Minister starts Pacific tour in the Solomons

China's Foreign Minister Wang Yi and a 20-strong delegation arrived in the Solomon Islands Thursday at the start of an eight-nation tour that comes amid growing concerns about Beijing's military and financial ambitions in the South Pacific region.

China says the trip builds on a long history of friendly relations

between Beijing and the island nations.

But Australia scrambled to counter the move by sending its own Foreign Minister Penny Wong to Fiji to shore up support in the Pacific. Wong had been on the job just five days following an Australian election and had just arrived back Wednesday night from a meeting in Tokyo.

In Fiji, Wong said it was up to each island nation to decide what

partnerships they formed and what agreements they signed, but urged them to consider the benefits of sticking with Australia.

"Australia will be a partner that doesn't come with strings attached nor imposing unsustainable financial burdens," Wong said. "We are a partner that won't erode Pacific priorities or Pacific institutions."

Meanwhile, the Media Association of Solomon Islands called

on its members to boycott a news conference in the capital, Honiara, held by Wang and his counterpart from the Solomon Islands, Jeremiah Manele, following a meeting between the pair.

That's because only selected media were invited to the event, and the schedule allowed for just a single question to be asked of Wang by China's state-owned broadcaster CCTV. "It's a tough call to make

regarding the media boycott for the press event on Thursday," wrote association president Georgina Kekea on Twitter. "Our protest is for our govt to see our disappointment. They have failed us & they failed to protect #democracy."

According to an official Chinese summary of the meeting, Wang told his counterpart that China would firmly support the Solomon Islands in its efforts to maintain national

security and territorial integrity, while Manele described the visit as historic and a "milestone in the relations" between the two countries.

China signed a security pact with the Solomon Islands last month in a move that sent shock waves around the world. That pact has raised fears that China could send troops to the island nation or even establish a military base there, not far from Australia. The Solomon Islands and

China say there are no plans for a base.

In another move by China, a draft document obtained by The Associated Press shows that Wang is hoping to strike a deal with 10 small Pacific nations during his visit. The sweeping agreement covers everything from security to fisheries and is seen by at least one Pacific leader as an attempt by Beijing to wrest control of the region.

‘Horrrifying’ conspiracy theories swirl around Texas shooting

By now it's as predictable as the calls for thoughts and prayers: A mass shooting leaves many dead, and wild conspiracy theories and misinformation about the carnage soon follow. It happened after Sandy Hook, after Parkland, after the Orlando nightclub shooting and after the deadly rampage earlier this month at a Buffalo grocery store.

Within hours of Tuesday's school shooting in Uvalde,

Texas, another rash began as internet users spread baseless claims about the man named as the gunman and his possible motives. Unfounded claims that the gunman was an immigrant living in the U.S. Illegally, or transgender, quickly emerged on Twitter, Reddit and other social media platforms. They were accompanied by familiar conspiracy theories suggesting the entire shooting was somehow staged.

The claims reflect broader problems with racism and intolerance toward trans-

gender people, and are an effort to blame the shooting on minority groups who already endure higher rates of online harassment and hate crimes, according to disinformation expert Jaime Longoria.

"It's a tactic that serves two purposes: It avoids real conversations about the issue (of gun violence), and it gives people who don't want to face reality a patsy, it gives them someone to blame," said Longoria, director of research at the Disinfo Defense League, a non-profit that works to fight racist misinformation.

In the hours after the shooting, posts falsely claiming the gunman was living in the country illegally went viral, with some users adding embellishments, including that he was "on the run from Border Patrol."

"He was an illegal alien wanted for murder from El Salvador," read one tweet liked and retweeted hundreds of times. "This is blood on Biden's hands and should have never happened."

The man who authorities say carried out the shooting,

18-year-old Salvador Ramos, is a U.S. Citizen, Texas Gov. Greg Abbott said in a news conference on Tuesday.

Moody's slashes India's economic growth forecast

New Delhi: Moody's Investors Service on Thursday slashed India's economic growth projection to 8.8 per cent for 2022 from 9.1 per cent earlier, citing high inflation.

In its update to Global Macro Outlook 2022-23, Moody's said high-frequency data suggests that the growth momentum from December quarter 2021 carried through into the first four months this year.

However, the rise in crude oil, food and fertilizer prices will weigh on household finances and spending in the months ahead. Rate hike to prevent energy and food inflation from becoming more generalized will slow the demand recovery's momentum, it said. "We have lowered our calendar-year 2022 growth forecast for India to 8.8 per cent from our March forecast of 9.1 per cent, while maintaining our 2023 growth forecasts at 5.4 per cent, Moody's said.

Strong credit growth, a large increase in investment intentions announced by the corporate sector, and a high budget allocation to capital spending by the government indicate that the investment cycle is strengthening.

"But unless global crude oil and food prices rise further, the

economy seems strong enough to maintain solid growth momentum," Moody's added. For 2022 and 2023, it projected inflation to be around 6.8 per cent and 5.2 per cent, respectively.

A rise in prices across all items from fuel to vegetables and cooking oil pushed WPI or wholesale price-based inflation to a record high of 15.08 per cent in April and retail inflation to a near eight-year high of 7.79 per cent.

High inflation prompted the Reserve Bank to hold an unscheduled meeting to raise the benchmark interest rate by 40 basis points to 4.40 per cent earlier this month.

In November last year, Moody's had projected a 9.3 per cent economic growth for India in the ongoing fiscal year (April-March). Earlier this month, S&P Global Ratings had cut India's growth projection for 2022-23 to 7.3 per cent, from 7.8 per cent earlier, on rising inflation and longer-than-expected Russia-Ukraine conflict.

In March, Fitch had cut India growth forecast to 8.5 per cent, from 10.3 per cent, citing sharply high energy prices on account of Russia-Ukraine war. The World Bank in April

slashed India's GDP forecast for 2022-23 to 8 per cent from 8.7 per cent predicted earlier, while IMF has cut the projection to 8.2 per cent from 9 per cent.

Asian Development Bank (ADB) has projected India's growth at 7.5 per cent, while RBI last month cut forecast to 7.2 per cent, from 7.8 per cent, amid volatile crude oil prices and supply chain disruptions due to the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war.

In its report on Thursday, Moody's said it has lowered its global growth projections and raised inflation forecasts for 2022 and 2023 on account of several negative factors.

The main drivers of the slowing economic momentum are ongoing supply shocks that are stoking inflation and eroding consumer purchasing power, and a shift towards more hawkish monetary policy globally, accompanied by financial market volatility, asset repricing and tighter credit conditions.

Stating that the post-pandemic economic recovery faces a complex set of challenges, it said several cross-currents have hit the global economy all at once, and will slow growth more significantly than it envisaged only a few months ago. **PTI**

Sensex halts 3-day decline, rebounds over 500 pts amid F&O expiry

Mumbai: Equity benchmarks mustered gains for the first time this week on Thursday as investors piled into the recently-battered metal, bank and IT stocks amid expiry of monthly derivative contracts.

Snapping its three-session losing streak, the 30-share BSE Sensex rallied 503.27 points or 0.94 per cent to settle at 54,252.53.

On similar lines, the broader NSE Nifty gained 144.35 points or 0.90 per cent to end at 16,170.15.

Tata Steel topped the Sensex gainers' chart, rallying 5.27 per cent after its recent rout, followed by SBI, HDFC Bank, Axis Bank, Nestle India, HDFC, ICICI Bank, TCS and Wipro.

In value terms, HDFC twins and ICICI Bank accounted for over half of the benchmark's gains. In contrast, Sun Pharma, Reliance Industries, Hindustan Unilever, Larsen & Toubro, Dr Reddy's and Bajaj Finance were the laggards, losing up to 1.16 per cent.

The market breadth was in favour of the bulls, with 24 of the 30 Sensex stocks closing in the green.

"Markets witnessed healthy short covering towards the closing hours that helped



key indices to reverse the 3-day losing streak. With the US FOMC minutes out of the way now, market is more or less getting prepared for the likely rate hikes, and hence we saw strong buying on the futures and options (F&O) expiry day.

"While we may see bouts of selling going ahead due to other negative factors like higher inflation, continuous FII selling, and Russia-Ukraine conflict, relief rallies will still be seen amidst volatility," said Shrikant Chouhan, Head of Equity Research (Retail), Kotak Securities Ltd.

Vinod Nair, Head of

Research at Geojit Financial Services, said after the heavy sell-off recently, market showed signs of exhaustion and can rebound for the short to medium-term.

"Technically, the broad market is in the oversold territory and fundamentally valuations are just below the three-year average. A key reason for the current correction is selling by FIIs and a reduction in domestic buying. A drop in FIIs selling will be an important reason for the bounce. **PTI**

RBI reduces net-worth requirement for non-bank Bharat Bill Payment units to ₹25 cr

Mumbai: The RBI on Thursday eased norms for non-bank entities to set up Bharat Bill Payment operating units by reducing the net-worth requirement to Rs 25 crore, with a view to encourage more players in the segment.

At present, a net worth of Rs 100 crore is required to obtain authorisation for a non-bank BBPOU (Bharat Bill Payment Operating Units).

Bharat Bill Payment System (BBPS) is an interoperable platform for bill payments and the scope and coverage of BBPS extends to all categories of billers who raise recurring bills.

"...The minimum net-worth requirement for non-bank Bharat Bill Payment Operating Units (BBPOUs) stands reduced to Rs 25 crore," the Reserve Bank of India said in a circular.

Users of BBPS enjoy benefits like standardised bill payment experience, centralised customer grievance redressal mechanism and prescribed



customer convenience fee.

The reduction in net-worth requirements follows an announcement regarding the same by the central bank in April.

The RBI had said while BBPS has seen an increase in the volume of transactions as well as number of onboarded billers, it is observed that there has not been a corresponding growth in the number of non-bank BBPOUs.

The requirement of ₹100 crore net worth for a non-bank BBPOU to obtain authorisation was viewed as a constraint to greater participation, it had said.

To increase participation, the RBI had decided to align the net worth requirement of non-bank BBPOUs with that of other non-bank participants which handle customer funds (like payment aggregators) and have a similar risk profile. **PTI**

Tata Power Renewable Energy commissions 100 MW solar project in Maharashtra

New Delhi: Tata Power Renewable Energy on Thursday announced the commissioning of a 100 MW solar project for Maharashtra State Electricity Distribution Company Ltd at Partur in Maharashtra.

"Tata Power Renewable Energy Ltd (TPREL), one of India's largest renewable energy companies and a wholly-owned subsidiary of Tata Power, has commissioned 100 MW project for Maharashtra State Electricity Distribution Company Limited (MSDCL) in Partur, Maharashtra," a company statement said.

According to the statement, the installation comprising over 4,11,900 monocrystalline PV modules is expected to reduce around 234 million tonnes of CO2 annually. The project was executed by Tata Power Solar Systems Limited, an arm of Tata Power, within the stipulated timeline of three-and-a-half months on 600 acres of land.

"Commissioning of MSDCL project in such a short time frame is a testimony to Tata Power's extraordinary project execution capabilities. It would help Maharashtra contribute to India's renewable energy ambitions by increasing the share of renewable energy in the state's overall energy mix," said Praveer Sinha, CEO & MD, Tata Power. **PTI**

Gold declines ₹241 amid weak global trends

New Delhi: Gold in the national capital on Thursday fell by ₹241 to ₹50,671 per 10 grams, reflecting a decline in international precious metal prices, according to HDFC Securities.

In the previous trade, the precious metal settled at ₹50,912 per 10 grams.

Silver, however, grows ₹87 to ₹61,384 per kg from ₹61,297 per kg in the previous trade.

In the international market, gold was trading lower at USD 1,848 per ounce and silver was flat at USD 21.85 per ounce. **PTI**

Centre forcing States to buy imported coal as cover-up of short supply of dry fuel: AIPEF

New Delhi: All India Power Engineers Federation (AIPEF) on Thursday alleged that the Centre is encroaching upon states' authority and forcing them to buy imported coal in a cover-up of its own inefficiencies in supplying domestic dry fuel to thermal plants.

The power ministry's directions issued earlier this month to generating companies is pushing states to import coal to increase blending to supplement domestic coal to offset the short supply of the dry fuel by Coal India Ltd, AIPEF said in a statement.



The ministry has also asked all imported coal-based power units to run at full capacity and said that the upward revision of tariff will be issued by a committee.

"The central government is

encroaching on the state authority and forcing them to buy imported coal to cover up its own inefficiencies in supplying domestic coal to thermal plants," AIPEF spokesperson V K Gupta alleged. **PTI**

GUJARAT CELEBRATES WORLD BEE DAY

To attract and enhance the relationship with global markets, the Government of India and State Governments are working to improve the quality of honey and collaborating and focusing on beekeeper capacity-building through the use of scientific techniques

To mark the occasion of World Bee Day, a national level function was held in Tent City-II, Ekta Nagar, Narmada, Gujarat on May 20, 2022. It was celebrated with great fervour. The Union Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister Narendra Singh Tomar mentioned that the Government is working hard under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership to bring about a Sweet Revolution in the country.

BHEL back in the black in FY 21-22

"So I thought what worked for me in the first two overs, I want to go back to that and give myself the best opportunity to get KL (Rahul) and Stoinis out. Fortunately, I got Stoinis out at the boundary," he said.

Harshal, who had bagged 32 wickets for RCB last season, once again has been their bowling backbone and has 19 wickets from 15 matches in this IPL.

Langer hits out at politics in CA

Former Australia coach Justin Langer has slammed the politics in the national cricket board as he opened up on his messy departure from the top job, specifically hitting out at interim chairman Richard Freudenstein.

In February, the 51-year-old stepped down as the senior men's team coach after rejecting a six-month contract extension, having hoped for a multi-year deal after overseeing a successful T20 World Cup campaign and an Ashes triumph.

The day after quitting his job, Langer had a heated conversation with Freudenstein.

Several Australian legends, including Mark Waugh, Adam Gilchrist, Ricky Ponting, Steve Waugh, Matthew Hayden and the late Shane Warne, came to their former teammate's defence and questioned Cricket Australia (CA) for the treatment meted out to Langer.

"The first thing he (Freudenstein) said to me was, 'It must make you feel so good that all your mates are support-



ing you in the media,'" Langer told a Chamber of Commerce and Industry WA event in Perth. "I said, 'Yeah it is, acting chairman, but with all due respect, those mates are also the all-time greats of Australian cricket. They are the fabric of Australian cricket. They are Australian cricket. They also work all around the world in cricket."

"So yeah, I'm glad my mates are looking after me. Imagine if you had have'.

"Ironically, the last six months of my coaching career

were the most enjoyable period of 12 years of coaching. Not only did we win everything, but I had energy, and I had focus, and I was happy - besides the bull**** politics."

The former Australia opener also clarified he had never spoken to anyone about taking the England coaching job after the sacking of Chris Silverwood.

KL becomes 1st batter to score 600+ runs in four IPL seasons

Even though his dream of winning the Indian Premier League (IPL) title ended once again with a heartbreaking 14-run defeat against Royal Challengers Bangalore on Wednesday (May 25), Lucknow Super Giants (LSG) skipper KL Rahul reached a unique batting milestone during his 58-ball 79-run innings against the Faf du Plessis-led side at Eden Gardens in Kolkata.

The 30-year-old became the first cricketer in the cash-rich league's history to score 600 plus runs in four different seasons. In the 15 matches of this year's edition of the IPL, the right-handed opening batter has scored 616 runs at an average of 51.33 and a strike rate of 135.38. He scored back-to-back hundreds against five-time winners Mumbai Indians and crossed the fifty-run mark on four occasions.

Before this year's edition, the top-order batter from Bengaluru had scored 626 runs in 13 matches of the 2021 edition, 670 runs in 14 matches of the 2020 season and 659 runs in the 2018

edition of the world's richest franchise cricket league.

KL, who is the second-highest run-getter in this season of the league up till now, finished as the third-highest run scorer in the 2018 and 2021 seasons, the second highest in 2019 and won the Orange Cap in the 2020 season, when the tournament was played in the United Arab Emirates.

Besides four 600+ seasons, KL scored 593 runs in the 2019 edition. West Indies T20 batting legend Chris Gayle and star Australian opening batter David Warner have scored more than 600 runs in the IPL on three different occasions and are now second on the list.

Both these left-handed batters have won the Orange Cap on two different occasions and are among the top 10 run-getters in the history of the league.

The 42-year-old Gayle crossed the 600 run mark in three consecutive years (2011-2013) while he was part of the Royal Challengers Bangalore side.

On the other hand, David Warner also achieved the feat in three consecutive seasons from 2016 to 2019 as the Sunrisers Hyderabad captain.



Mathews, Chandimal, bowlers get SL closer to series win

Mathews and Chandimal combined for 199 runs for the sixth wicket to take the game away from Bangladesh, despite Shakib Al Hasan's 5 for 96.

Nicolo Zaniolo won Roma their first ever major European trophy on Wednesday with the only goal in a 1-0 win over Feyenoord in the inaugural Europa Conference League final.

Italy international Zaniolo struck with a well-taken finish in the 32nd minute to earn Roma their first trophy of any kind since 2008 and cap a successful first season for coach Jose Mourinho in Rome.

Mourinho was moved to tears by his fifth continental cup as a coach, the first for an Italian team since he led Inter Milan to the Champions League 12 years ago.

"It was a real struggle but I'm really happy," Zaniolo said to Sky. "It was my dream and now I've done it."

Roma, Fairs Cup winners in 1961, rode their luck with Feyenoord having the lion's share of the play and twice striking the woodwork in the second half.

But they remained solid in the face of Dutch dominance and brought joy to one of Europe's most passionate and success-starved fan bases.

Over 50,000 fans packed the Stadio Olimpico in the Italian capital to watch their team make a little piece of history in Albania and poured onto the pitch once the trophy was secured.

Meanwhile the small corner of supporters allowed into Tirana's National Stadium roared with delight once referee Istvan Kovacs blew his whistle to end their team's trophy drought.

"We know that after these amazing victories it's always difficult to start again but a real team wins, celebrates and then gets

going again," said Rome-born captain Lorenzo Pellegrini.

For 1970 European champions Feyenoord it was their first ever defeat in a European final as well as being the first loss in the competition for Arne Slot's team.

Zaniolo broke the deadlock with the only real moment of magic in what was a tight, scrappy

opening half.

He expertly brought down Gianluca Mancini's ball over the top that just escaped Gernot Trauner before flicking a finish past the onrushing Justin Bijlow.

The goal made Zaniolo the first Italian to score in a European final since Filippo Inzaghi in 2007 as well as a confirmed hero for Roma

fans. Feyenoord had dominated the ball, creating nothing of interest, but that changed almost immediately after the restart.

Trauner diverted a low cross off the post and seconds later Rui Patricio made his first real save of the match, the Portuguese reacting well to push Guus Til's shot away. And the 34-year-old was called

into action again four minutes after the break, flinging himself to his left to just tip Tyrell Malacia's rocket of a shot onto the woodwork.

Mourinho hails Conference League 'history' for Roma

Jose Mourinho said that he and Roma had made history after winning the Europa Conference League on Wednesday, the club's first ever major European trophy.

Portuguese coaching icon Mourinho tried and failed to hold back the tears after Roma beat Feyenoord in their first continental final in over three decades and he was still emotional by the time he hailed his team after the trophy ceremony.

Roma fans have taken Mourinho into their hearts during an up and down season which culminated in Wednesday's 1-0 win in Tirana which ended a 14-year trophy drought for the capital club.

"I've been at Roma for 11 months, I knew the moment I arrived what it meant to the people. They had been waiting for something like this," Mourinho told Sky.

"This was not work tonight, this was history. We had to write history. We wrote it."

Wednesday's triumph was his fifth European title and made



him the first coach to win all current UEFA competitions.

And he confirmed that he would be staying at Roma next season to build on the solid work done in his debut season.

"I am staying, there's no doubt about that," he said.

"We need to see what our owners, who are fantastic people, want to do next season because this is history, but we can build a special project."

"Now I'm going to go on holiday, sit on the beach and think about it all for a while."

Feyenoord were clearly on top.

The Dutch side continued to push but a spirited defensive dis-

play typical of Mourinho's teams held them off and handed Roma a rare moment of glory.



Sreeshankar claims long jump Gold in Greece

India's premier long jumper Murali Sreeshankar won the Gold medal at the 12th International Jumping Meeting in Kallithea, Greece with an effort of 8.31m.

The Tokyo Olympian is the current national record holder with a jump of 8.36m, which he had achieved last month.

Sreeshankar was followed by Swede Thobias Montler, who claimed Silver with an 8.27m jump, and Jules Pommery of France, who bagged Bronze with an 8.17m effort in the 10-man field. Only the top three jumpers crossed the 8m-mark.

Jeswin Aldrin, meanwhile, finished fifth after he hit the 7.69m mark at the 17th Iberoamerican Meeting in Huelva, Spain.

Filip Pravdiva of Croatia (7.91m), Uruguay's Emiliano Lasa (7.82m) and Peruvian José Luis Mandros (7.77m) completed the top three of the seven-man field.

Alcaraz, widely tipped as a title contender, rallied from the brink to defeat compatriot Albert Ramos-Vinolas 6-1, 6-7 (7/9), 5-7, 7-6 (7/2), 6-4 after four hours and 34 minutes.

"I feel tired," said Alcaraz. "It was a great battle, a great match and we fought until the last point."

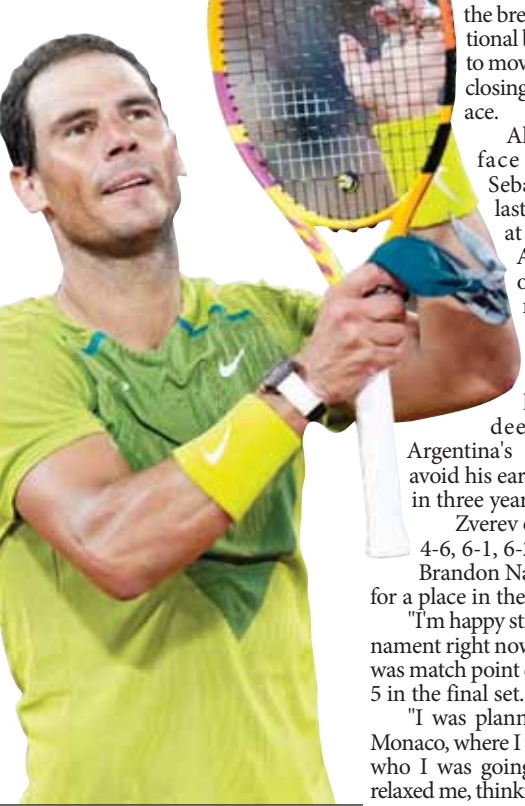
The 19-year-old Alcaraz is attempting to become just the eighth teenager to capture a major men's title, and backed as the man to break the stranglehold of Djokovic and Nadal.

But he was pushed to the limit by the seasoned Ramos-Vinolas, 15 years his elder and whose best performance at a Grand Slam came when he made the quarter-finals in Paris six years ago.

Alcaraz, the tour's dominant player in 2022 with a season-leading four titles, fought off a match point to break Ramos-Vinolas as he served at 5-4 in the fourth set.

He then clawed his way back from 3-0 in the decider, producing an outrageous backhand pass to retrieve

the break and more sensational baseline scrambling to move 5-4 in front before closing out victory with an ace.

Alcaraz goes on to face US 27th seed Sebastian Korda, the last man to defeat him at Monte Carlo in April in what was his only loss in 19 matches on clay this season.

Zverev, a 2021 semi-finalist, dug himself out of a deep hole against Argentina's Sebastian Baez to avoid his earliest loss at a major in three years.

Zverev overcame Baez 2-6, 4-6, 6-1, 6-2, 7-5 and will play Brandon Nakashima of the US for a place in the last 16.

"I'm happy still being in the tournament right now," said Zverev, who was match point down on serve at 4-5 in the final set.

World No. 227 adds Pliskova to casualty list

Jeanjean is the lowest-ranked



woman to beat a top 10 player at Roland Garros in 34 years.

"I don't really realise what's going on. I find it just incredible," said Jeanjean, all smiles on the court just after his victory.

Considered a future star at 12, Jeanjean saw her career abruptly halted by injuries, including a triple dislocation of the knee.

She then left to study in the United States, only returning to

top-level tennis at the end of 2020.

"I wanted to come back so as not to regret anything. I think I made the right choice," she said.

Pliskova has made the second week at Roland Garros just once in 11 visits.

World number three Paula Badosa overcame a scare to defeat 68th-ranked Kaja Juvan of Slovenia 7-5, 3-6, 6-2.

Badosa, a quarter-finalist in 2021, recovered from a break down in the decider to set up a meeting with 29th seed Veronika Kudermetova for a spot in the last 16.

Also going through was US 11th seed Jessica Pegula who needed eight match points to defeat Anhelina Kalinina of Ukraine 6-1, 5-7, 6-4.
