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India has broken shackles of colonialism, says Modi

PM opens Mahakal Lok corridor at Mahakaleshwar

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said India has now broken the "shackles of colonialism" and cultural destinations across the country are seeing overall development.

The PM was speaking after dedicating to the nation the first phase of the "Shri Mahakal Lok" corridor at Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh, amid chanting of "mantras" and performing of pujas. The project is being developed at a cost of ₹856 crore.

"Blessed to have got the opportunity to dedicate #ShriMahakalLok to the nation. This is an important endeavour that will deepen the connection of our citizens with our rich history and glorious culture," Modi tweeted.

The PM unveiled a large "shivaling" covered in strands of sacred red threads placed below the grand gateway — Nandi Dwar — of "Mahakal Lok" to mark the inauguration of the mega corridor in Ujjain.

The PM unveiled the shivling by pressing a remote-control button from a short distance from the gateway in the presence of a large number of

seers in the background.

Speaking at a public function afterward, Modi said the corridor project will add to Ujjain's vibrancy.

"Spirituality is contained in every particle and divine energy is being transmitted in every corner of Ujjain," he said,

adding, "Ujjain has led India's prosperity, knowledge, dignity and literature for thousands of years."

"Innovation comes with renovation. India is renovating what it had lost in the era of slavery. India is renovating it and restoring its glory," he

said. The country has now broken the "shackles of colonialism" and cultural destinations across India are seeing all-around development, the PM said.

The project, making an elaborate makeover around the Mahakal temple, aims to

decongest the entire area and also to put special emphasis on conservation and restoration of heritage structures. The first phase of "Mahakal Lok" has been developed at ₹351 crore.

The 900 metre-long Mahakal Lok corridor built at the Mahakaleshwar temple at Ujjain. The corridor now has around 108 aesthetically ornate pillars made of intricately carved sandstones that depict the Anand Tandav Swaroop (Lord Shiva's dance form), 200 statues and murals of Lord Shiva and goddess Shakti. Modi offered prayers at the temple before he inaugurated the corridor project. The world-class modern amenities would enliven the experience of the pilgrims visiting the temple, top officials said. Under the project, the temple precinct will be expanded nearly seven times.

Modi took a round of the corridor on foot as also on battery-operated vehicles along with Madhya Pradesh Governor Mangu Bhair Patel and Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan. Ahead of dedicating to the nation the first phase of the Shri Mahakal Lok corridor, the PM performed puja at Lord Mahakal temple in Ujjain.

Modi, attired in traditional dhoti and gamcha (stole), entered the sanctum sanctorum of the Lord Mahakal temple around 6 pm.

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CBI charges DMK's Raja in ₹5.5 cr DA case

Chargesheet says Raja got ₹4.56 cr in quid pro quo

The company had later bought agricultural land in Coimbatore.

The CBI has filed a chargesheet against former Telecom Minister and DMK leader A Raja for allegedly amassing disproportionate assets to the tune of ₹5.53 crore during his tenure as a Cabinet Minister in the UPA I and UPA II.

In its chargesheet filed before a Special CBI court in Chennai, the agency has alleged that a close associate of Raja, C Krishnamurthy, had set up a company Kovai Shelters Promoters in January, 2007 in which a payment of ₹4.56 crore was received in February that year from a Gurugram-based real estate company as commission for purchase of land in Kanchipuram, officials said.

It is alleged that the payment was not for the land deal but a quid pro quo for giving the real estate firm the status of an infrastructure company by Raja during his tenure as Union Minister, they said.

In the chargesheet filed in August this year, the CBI has alleged that the company had not "undertaken any other real estate activity" other than the purported land deal for the real estate firm.

The agency has alleged that as Minister Raja had garnered assets worth ₹5.53 crore, including the payment of ₹4.56 crore to the company in which Raja's close relatives were directors, which he could not satisfactorily account for, they said.

The CBI has alleged assets in question were disproportionate to the tune of 579 per cent from his known sources of income, they said.

The agency had registered the case in 2015 against Raja and 16 others, including his nephew Parmesh, wife Parameswari, his associate Krishnamurthy who is also director of Kovai Shelters Pvt Limited, wife of Sadiq Bacha, an alleged associate of Raja who had committed suicide, and Reha Banu, a director in Greenhouse Promoters which was earlier owned by Bacha among others.

The CBI had booked Raja in connection with the 2G spectrum allocation case but he was acquitted by a court as the CBI failed to prove any charges of corruption against him.

4-month cap for nod to sue public servants must, authority liable for delay: SC

The Supreme Court on Tuesday held the four-month statutory provision for granting sanction to prosecute government officials in criminal cases is "mandatory", saying delay in prosecuting the corrupt "breeds a culture of impunity" and leads to "systemic resignation" to the corruption in public life.

"The competent authority shall be accountable for the delay and be subject to judicial review and administrative action by the Central Vigilance Commission."

A bench of Justices BR Gavai and PS Narasimha, in its 30-page verdict, however, said though the delay in granting the sanction to prosecute can be assailed in the high courts and the top court, it would not be a ground for quashing the criminal cases against government officials.

It said the sanctioning authority must bear in mind that public confidence in the maintenance of the rule of law, which is fundamental in the administration of justice, is at stake here. "By causing delay in considering the request for sanction, the sanctioning authority stultifies judicial scrutiny, thereby vitiating the process of determination of the allegations against the corrupt official," it said.

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India rejects Russia's 'secret' plea on UN resolution against annexation

India among 100 nations calls for public vote

India has voted against Russian demand in the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) for a secret ballot on a draft resolution condemning Moscow's annexation of four regions of Ukraine.

Over 100 countries, including India, called for a public vote on the resolution while Russia appealed against the ruling of the president of the General Assembly.

The voting late on Monday took place hours after Russia

carried out multiple strikes in Ukraine, including capital Kyiv, killing ten people there and injuring more than 60 across the war-ravaged country.

The latest round of voting in the UNGA was conducted on a motion moved by Albania.

The motion said voting

on the draft resolution condemning Russia's "illegal so-called referendums" and "attempted illegal annexation" of the Donetsk, Kherson, Luhansk, and Zaporizhzhia regions of Ukraine, should be taken by a recorded vote.

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IMF warns of global slump, cuts India's growth forecast

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) on Tuesday projected a grim outlook for the global economy even as it cut its projection of India's GDP growth in 2022 to 6.8 per cent and warned that the

"risks of recession are rising" around the world and that the world economy is facing a "period of historic fragility."

The IMF is downgrading its outlook for the world economy for 2023, citing a long list of threats that include Russia's war against Ukraine, chronic inflation pressures, punishing interest rates and the lingering consequences of the global pandemic.

The 190-country lending agency forecast that the global economy would eke out growth of just 2.7 per cent next year, down from the 2.9 per

cent it had estimated in July. The IMF left unchanged its forecast for international growth this year — a modest 3.2 per cent, a sharp deceleration from last year's 6 per cent expansion.

In July, the IMF projected a gross domestic product (GDP) growth of 7.4 per cent for India in the fiscal year that started in April 2022. Even that forecast was lower than 8.2 per cent projected in January this year. India had grown at 8.7 per cent in 2021-22 fiscal (April 2021 to March 2022).

In its annual World Economic Outlook report released on Tuesday, the IMF said outlook for India is growth of 6.8 per cent in 2022 — a 0.6 percentage point downgrade since the July forecast, reflecting a weaker-than-expected

outturn in the second quarter and more subdued external demand.

Meanwhile, IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva warned that the "risks of recession are rising" around the world and that the global economy is facing a "period of historic fragility."

In its latest estimates, the IMF slashed its outlook for growth in the United States to 1.6 per cent this year, down from a July forecast of 2.3 per cent. It expects meagre 1 per cent US growth next year.

The fund foresees China's economy growing just 3.2 per cent this year, down drastically from 8.1 per cent last year.

Beijing has instituted draconian zero-Covid policy and has cracked down on excessive real estate lending, disrupting business activity. China's growth is forecast to accelerate to 4.4 per cent next year.

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SC agrees to hear plea challenging constitutional validity of talaq-e-hasan

The Supreme Court on Tuesday admitted the pleas seeking "talaq-e-hasan" and all other forms of "unilateral extrajudicial divorce" to be declared unconstitutional. "Talaq-e-Hasan" is a form of divorce among Muslims by which a man can dissolve the marriage by pronouncing the word "talaq" once every month over a three-month period.

A three-judge bench headed by Justices SK Kaul asked the Centre, National Commission for Women, National Human Rights Commission and others to file their responses within four weeks.

"Counsel for the private respondent (husband) has entered appearance and seeks

to affirm that he is not agreeable to settlement even on issue of further alimony. List in the third week of January for final hearing," said the bench, also comprising Justices Abhay S Oka and Vikram Nath. The apex court was hearing three separate petitions, including the one filed by Ghaziabad resident Benazeer Heena, who claimed to be victims of unilateral extrajudicial Talaq-e-Hasan.

They have also sought a direction to the Centre to frame the guidelines for gender and religion-neutral and uniform grounds of divorce and procedure for all citizens. The top court had earlier impeached the husbands of the petitioners and sought their response to the pleas filed by them.

Child star of India's Oscar pick Rahul dies

Rahul Koli was very much excited to see "Chhello Show", India's official entry to Oscars 2023, on screen, but days before its release the teenage actor who played the character of the friend of the protagonist in the Gujarati film died of leukemia.

He was 17. "Chhello Show" (Last Film Show), directed by Pan Nalin, is slated for October 14 release.

Rahul, who hails from Hapa town in Gujarat's Jamnagar district, died of leukemia on October 2, nearly four months after he was hospitalised at the cancer hospital in Ahmedabad, his father Ramu Koli said on Tuesday.

Rahul has played the role of the friend of the nine-year-old protagonist Samay (Bhavin Rabari) in the Gujarati coming-of-age drama "Chhello Show". The film was nominated as India's official entry for the 95th Academy Awards.

"Rahul was looking forward to watching the movie on the big screen. He used to say that the release of the movie would launch his future, little knowing that he would die before October 14," Koli, an autorickshaw driver, told PTI over the phone.



Rahul was diagnosed with leukaemia—the cancer of the body's blood-forming tissues—this year. He was initially treated at a Jamnagar hospital. After remaining in the hospital for two weeks, he was admitted to the Ahmedabad cancer hospital four months ago.

"He was undergoing treatment and breathed his last on October 2," Koli said.

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Malaria-hit Pak to buy 60L mosquito nets from India

Pakistan's Health Ministry has approved the purchase of over 6 million mosquito nets from India, as the country scrambles to contain the spread of malaria and other vector-borne diseases due to the unprecedented floods, according to a media report.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) is using financial resources provided by Global Fund to acquire the nets for Pakistan, Geo.Tv report said. The WHO officials said they are planning to obtain mosquito nets as early as possible and are hopeful that these would be obtained by next month via the Wagah route.

Over 1,700 people were killed, 33 million displaced and a third of the country was submerged under water in the worst floods to hit Pakistan,

brought about by unprecedented rain since mid-June.

In September, the WHO warned that a surge in diseases like malaria can cause a "second disaster." Last week, the WHO warned of 2.7 million malaria cases in 32 districts in Pakistan by January 2023.

"Malaria is spreading at a rapid pace in 32 flood-affected districts of the country where thousands of children are infected with the mosquito-borne disease," officials said.

Pakistan's Health Ministry had sought permission to procure mosquito nets from India last month, the report said.

The official said they had requested the Global Fund for the arrangement of mosquito nets for the 26 most-affected districts of Sindh, Punjab and Balochistan, where Plasmodium Falciparum cases were reported.

Sea of humanity walks with Mulayam on his last journey

Amid the chants of "Netaji Amar rahe", Saifai bid a final goodbye to Samajwadi Party patriarch Mulayam Singh Yadav on Tuesday. Netaji was cremated with full State honours at this native village. His son and party chief Akhilesh Yadav lit the sandalwood funeral pyre. A sea of humanity turned up for the last glimpse of the man who dominated the UP politics for more than three decades.

Mulayam turned Saifai from a village to a Tehsil (sub division) in 1994 when he headed a Samajwadi party-led coalition Government with the Bahujan Samaj party (BSP).

The former Uttar Pradesh CM died aged 82 at a private hospital in Haryana's Gurugram on Monday. His body was brought to Saifai on Monday evening.

A large number of people and political dignitaries turned up for his cremation in Saifai

on Tuesday. The Yogi Adityanath Government declared State mourning for three days on Monday to console the death of Mulayam, with hundreds queued up for the final darshan amid the drizzle, Yadav's body was moved around 10 am Tuesday from his "kothi" to a bigger hall on the Mela Ground premises to allow people to pay their last

respects. Over a lakh people descended to Saifai to pay their last respects to their "Netaji", as he was fondly called.

Akhilesh, Mulayam's brother Shivpal Yadav and other family members were onboard a truck decked up with garlands of flowers. A large number of people marched along the vehicle.

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India has so far not condemned the Russian invasion of Ukraine and maintained that the crisis must be resolved through diplomacy and dialogue. Moreover, India has abstained on votes on the Ukraine conflict in the UN General Assembly and the Security Council.

L-G asks Chief Secretary to look into CIC's complaint

Mahurkar flags Govt's dismal RTI record, AAP says letter written at BJP's behest

Delhi Lieutenant Governor (L-G) VK Saxena has directed Chief Secretary (CS) Naresh Kumar to take corrective actions as per rules at the earliest after receiving a letter from the Central Information Commission (CIC) over the "failure" of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Government in implementing the Right to Information (RTI) Act.

In his letter, CIC Uday Mahurkar pointed out that the RTI Act had been reduced to a "lame duck Act", especially in departments such as Revenue, Public Works Department (PWD), health, power and bodies like the Delhi State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation (DSIIDC) and Delhi Subordinate Services Selection Board (DSSSB) which directly deal with citizens.

In the letter, Mahurkar

said that departments refuse to give information or give "misinformation" to people and information relating to irregularities and corruption is held back. The letter from Mahurkar attached specific replies from the above-mentioned departments, pointing out stonewalling and false, misleading information.

Responding to the CIC's letter, the AAP Government said that Mahurkar has written this letter at the BJP's behest. "It is painful to see that a body like the CIC is indulging in dirty politics. The Delhi Government takes pride in the fact that we implement RTI Act in its true letter

and spirit," the Delhi Government said in a statement.

In the letter, Mahurkar said that it was a matter of concern that in more than 60 per cent of the cases concerning the Revenue department the Public Information Officers (PIOs) do not remain present citing official duty and depute clerks and junior personnel to attend the hearing. In many cases there is a clear intent on their part to stonewall the information because of their questionable nexus. This is more than evident in cases where huge properties including ancestral lands are involved and clearly indicate high level corruption.

"Serious issues of misgovernance marked by corruption and nepotism remain undressed at public and individual levels in Delhi as these departments/entities show disregard for the principles of transparency and accountability as enshrined in the

RTI Act, 2005, and run roughshod over the quest for crucial information from genuine, needy appellants that often impacts their property and life as they battle with a section of allegedly corrupt and lethargic officials of these departments/entities", read the letter.

Mahurkar's stated that in many cases the RTI applicants seeking information are in a miserable condition as genuine information regarding corruption and irregularity in Government functioning is being held back with alleged ulterior motives. The PIOs either refuse to share legitimate information or serve appellants with misinformation.

"In view of the seriousness of issues highlighted by the CIC, the L-G's Secretariat has directed the CS to take requisite corrective action as per rules in place to address the matter at the earliest," a source from the L-G's office said.

Key departments defeating RTI Act's very purpose: CIC

Coming out hard against the Delhi Government for not addressing "serious issues of misgovernance marked by corruption and nepotism", the Central Information Commission (CIC) in a letter to Lieutenant Governor (L-G) VK Saxena accused several key departments of having failed to implement the Right To Information (RTI) Act thereby defeating the legislation's very purpose of "transparency and accountability".

The CIC, Uday Mahurkar enlisted the information watchdog's decisions in several cases to back his allegations.

"One RTI filed by Rahul Sharma, seeks information regarding the tenders of DSDI-IC concerning public works in unauthorised colonies which have been regularised and therefore are connected with the progress of the lowest strata of society. In this case tenders worth Rs 100 crore as per Government estimation have been given at prices which are 40-50 per cent less than the official tender cost and show a clear

nexus between the officials and the contractors," the letter cited.

The DSIIDC denied all the charges and said these are proved false by the fact that the DSIIDC had hired three 'Third Party Quality Assurance (TPQA)' agencies to ensure quality check, measurement and inspection of their works and all these TPQAs were reputed ones associated with reputed Government entities, it stated.

Taking cognisance, the Commission advised the Managing Director of DSIIDC, to investigate the matter in larger interest of transparency and accountability in Government system and take corrective action against the officials if they are found to be involved in manipulation and dishonest practices in awarding the 31 tenders in question in a span of 45 days from the date of receipt of this order.

"In another RTI filed by Kamaljeet Singh, the information is not forthcoming on tenders of the PWD and certain other Delhi Government entities which have been allegedly awarded the tenders at 30 per



cent less rates as compared to the official tender price or have seen doubling of the tender cost on the other extreme side, thus raising serious issues of transparency, rather indicating a corrupt nexus between the officials and the contractors involved," the letter pointed out.

In another instance, RTI was filed by Hisamudin, seeking information regarding new electric connections under private or commercial use in unauthorised buildings and other details regarding it.

"However, Power Department, in response, said that while replying the RTI application they could not provide information according to the High Court Order, as the BSBS Yamuna Power Limited (BYPL) cannot be defined as a public authority according to

the RTI Act," CIC data read.

"When the issue was brought before the Commission by an applicant the BYPL officials simply told the Commission that RIL doesn't listen to their pleas on the issue. The appellant kept on insisting that the BYPL should be brought under the ambit of the RTI after the SC order to address the irregularities of the DISCOM while dealing with the common men since it was running an essential service. This issue must be addressed without delay since it is not just a serious case of failure of the Government to protect genuine public interest involving a key essential service but virtually an example of a Government stabbing its citizens in the back," the CIC stated, quoting another instance.

Kejriwal flags off 50 CNG-powered cluster buses

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday flagged off 50 low-floor CNG-powered cluster buses and said they will improve connectivity to the rural belts of the national Capital. He also flagged off 30 Toyota Innova cars and 36 bikes for the enforcement wing of the Transport Department.

"These vehicles will be involved in enforcing lane discipline. From April, we started the lane discipline drive," he said at the event.

According to Transport Department officials, this is the first time motorcycles have been inducted in the enforcement team. This will ensure enforcement teams can enter narrow lanes where cars cannot.

Kejriwal said there will be 1,800 electric buses on the roads of Delhi by 2023, while 80 per cent of the city's fleet will be electric by 2025.

The Government has floated a tender for 1,500 electric buses, and by November next year, 1,800 such buses will be

plying on the roads of Delhi, he said.

"We have inducted 50 new low-floor CNG (air-conditioned) buses. From many years, people faced inconvenience since there were no buses. But in the last two-three years, electric, CNG, cluster buses have been inducted," he added.

The new buses will be kept at the new Bawana bus depot. "This will help rural connectivity. There are already 360 cluster bus routes. There will be six new routes for these buses that will serve rural areas," he said.

Later, in a tweet in Hindi, Kejriwal said, "Today 50 new CNG buses and 66 new vehicles for road safety and bus lane enforcement were flagged off from the Rajghat depot. As many as 7,320 buses are on the roads of Delhi now, the highest-ever. By 2025, more than 10,000 buses will be in service of the people of Delhi, 80 per cent of them will be electric buses."

After flagging off 50 new CNG buses of Cluster Scheme (Private Contract), CM Kejriwal has given information in his tweet that now 7,320 buses of Delhi Transport Corporation are running in Delhi. In a letter addressed to CM Kejriwal, Gupta also expressed his concern about poor state of the DTC.

East Delhi to get clean Ganga water after old Bhagirathi WTP pipeline change: Kejriwal

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday said the 40-year-old water pipeline of the Bhagirathi Water Treatment Plant will be replaced, a move which will help provide clean Ganga water to residents of east Delhi.

The move will also help in ensuring round-the-clock water supply to the region.

"The Delhi government has decided to replace the 40-year-old water pipeline of Bhagirathi Plant. With the replacement of this 20-km-long pipeline, as many as 130 MGD of clean Ganga water will be supplied to lakhs of people in east Delhi. It will prove to be a milestone towards providing 24x7 water to the people of Delhi," Kejriwal said in a tweet in Hindi.

The Delhi government has been taking various decisions to

improve the water supply across the city and also to clean River Yamuna.

Earlier this month, Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia had approved the construction of a new filter house at the Nangloi Water Treatment Plant (WTP) at a cost of Rs 59.7 crore to ensure round-the-clock water supply to the national capital.

With the new filter house having advanced technology, the Nangloi WTP will be able to treat 10-15 per cent more water during the peak summer season and meet the increased demand. Kejriwal on Monday said 85 million gallons of sewage from Keshopur and Najafgarh will be cleaned before it flows into the Najafgarh drain.

This, according to Kejriwal, is expected to reduce the pollution load in the River Yamuna by 30 per cent.

Women staff of Fatehpur Beri PS accuse cop of sexual harassment

All women staff of South district's Fatehpuri Beri police station have given a complaint to Special Commissioner of Vigilance against head constable Mahavir Singh for sexually harassing them. The women personnel also alleged that the head constable, who is also duty officer of the police station, was also indulged in taking bribes, misbehaving and insulting the police station staff and even involved in extortion.

Chandan Chowdhary, the Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP), South district said that an enquiry has been initiated. The complaint was given a month ago.

"Head Constable, Mahavir, posted as 'Chitta Munshi' of the Police Station misbehaves and sexually harass women police personnel for making physical relations on pretext of

giving them duty post of their choice in Chitta. Mahavir post of Chitta Munshi is not appropriate as per standing order of Police Commissioner," said women staff in their complaint.

"Mahavir even takes bribes in cash and valuable items for granting leaves to certain officers.

He also tries to manipulate duty records of the police station and also officers on duty are never given women staff, if needed, saying that there is shortage of staff. Even the station house officer (SHO) believes and runs the police station according to Chitta. The HC Mahavir also asks the beat staff to allow boring and extortion," they alleged.

"We all senior officers tried to complain to SHO, he replied that he and Mahavir, both are male officers and no one will believe us as we are women," the women alleged in the complaint.

Delhi Police examining hate speeches by BJP MP, MLA

The Delhi Police is examining the alleged hate speeches made by BJP MP Parvesh Verma, the party's Loni MLA Nand Kishor Gurjar and others at an event here earlier this week, officials said on Tuesday. The speeches are being transcribed for analysis, they said, adding that a complaint has been received against Verma but no FIR has been registered against him.

The Congress and other Opposition parties have demanded action against the BJP lawmakers for the alleged hate speeches and several videos of the event have appeared online.

An FIR was registered on Monday against the VHP and other organisers for allegedly not taking permission for the Sunday event. VHP had rubbished the claim as "laughable"

and said that police personnel were deployed during the meeting in Dilshad Garden.

On Tuesday, police officials said that all alleged hate speeches delivered during the event are being closely monitored.

"The investigation is underway. All the speeches given by those present including that of Parvesh Verma and Nand Kishore Gurjar are being examined. Their speeches are being transcribed for analysis," said a senior police officer.

An FIR has been registered against the organisers for not taking permission for the event under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code.

The event was organised by several Hindu right-wing outfits, including the Vishva Hindu Parishad.

"Let alone permission, we fixed the venue at Ramlala Ground in Dilshad Garden

after suggestion and recommendation by senior police officers. We earlier had planned to hold the gathering near Manish's house but on the request of the police changed it to Ramlila Maidan," VHP spokesperson Vinod Bansal had claimed.

Delhi BJP MP Parvesh Verma had called for a 'total boycott' of a community at the event held to protest the killing of a Hindu youth in northeast Delhi. Manish (19) was stabbed to death in Sundar Nagri earlier this month.

Police have arrested all the accused in the case - Aalam, Bilal and Faizan - and have said they killed the youth in an old rivalry.

In a purported video of the event, Verma could be heard saying, "Wherever you find them, there is only one way to straighten them out -- total boycott. Do you agree with me?"

Police question Gautam over presence at conversion event

The Delhi Police on Monday questioned former Minister in the AAP-led Delhi Government, Rajendra Pal Gautam for four hours at the Paharganj police station, over his presence at a mass religious conversion event where Hindu deities were denounced. Police said that Gautam reached the police station a little before 2.30 PM, hours after he was served a summons notice by the police, which called for the questioning.

"I received the notice today (Tuesday) and will cooperate with the police. We are those who follow Babasaheb Ambedkar and the Indian Constitution," Gautam, tweeted while sharing the notice on social media platform.

Terror funding: 1 held in NIA raids on AHET

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Tuesday conducted searches at multiple locations in Jammu and Kashmir and arrested one person in the case related to suspect funding activities of Al Huda Educational Trust (AHET) in Rajouri district of the Union Territory.

The NIA conducted searches in 18 locations in Rajouri, Poonch, Jammu, Srinagar, Bandipora, Shopian, Pulwama and Budgam districts of the Valley and arrested Md. Ameer Shamshi of Rajouri in the case related to criminal activities of AHET, the NIA said in a statement.

Jamaat-e-Islami (JeI) Jammu and Kashmir, after being declared as an 'unlawful association' under Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, has been continuing its activities through its frontal organisations. One such organisation is AHET of district Rajouri, the agency said.

"AHET has been found



raising funds through various means, including donations, hawala etc purportedly for charitable purposes, but are instead using these funds to radicalise and incite the youth of J&K for unlawful activities and disrupt the territorial integrity and sovereignty of India," it said.

The NIA had suo-moto registered the case on September 3. Investigations have revealed that the arrested accused Md. Ameer Shamshi is the Chairperson (Nizam-e-Ala) of AHET and acts on the directions of the Chief Patron of the Trust. Investigations have also

revealed that the ex-officio Chief Patron of AHET is the Ameer-e-Jamaat, Jel (J&K). The trust has continued to raise funds even after the declaration of JeI, J&K as an 'unlawful association'. Suspect links with other NGOs and trusts operating in the Kashmir valley have also emerged during the investigations.

During the searches, several mobile devices and documents related to funding, properties and the like have been seized. Further investigations in the case are in progress, it added.

ED raids on premises of officials, netas, bizmen in Chhattisgarh

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday conducted searches at the premises of senior officials, including a Deputy Secretary of Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, businessmen and politicians of the ruling Congress Government in Chhattisgarh, at different locations in the State on Tuesday.

The ED teams searched several locations related to Deputy Secretary to the CM, Soumya Chaurasia, in Durg, Chartered Accountant Vijay Malu in Devendra Nagar, Raipur, Raigarh Collector Ranu Sahu's residence in Raigarh, Agni Chandrakar in Mahasamund, Suryakant Tiwari in Anupam Nagar, Raipur and mining chief and IAS officer JP Maurya in Raipur. Maurya is the husband of Ranu Sahu.

In the Mahasamund district, searches were conducted at locations linked to politicians and businessmen. Those under the scanner are Vikas Nigam



president and former MLA of Agni Chandrakar, Laxmikant Tiwari, Ajay Naidu, a close aide of Suryakant Tiwari, District Congress president Badal Makkad and real estate businessman Sunny Lunia, officials said. Over a dozen ED officers landed at Raigarh collector Ranu Sahu's residence in the morning for carrying out the search operation. Separate teams of the ED started conducting raids in the morning in state capital Raipur, Raigarh, Mahasamund, Korba and other districts, they said.

Dubbing the searches as an "act of intimidation", Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel said the opposition BJP is not able to fight directly, hence it is trying to fight through the ED, Income Tax (I-T) department

and the Department of Revenue Intelligence (DRI).

Baghel said, "I have already said that they will come again and it's not the last time. Their visits will increase as the election approaches. This is just an act of intimidation and nothing else."

The state Assembly elections are due in November 2023. Last month, the I-T department had conducted raids at the premises of businessmen associated with steel and coal businesses.

Similar raids conducted by the I-T department in June-July this year covered the premises of coal businessman Suryakant Tiwari and the Deputy Secretary posted in the Chief Minister's Office.

According to an IT Department reference to the Chhattisgarh government, searches against Saumya Chaurasia, Joint Secretary Anil Tuteja and RERA chairman Vivek Dhand (1981-batch IAS officer) revealed generation of tainted wealth to the tune of crores of rupees from distilleries of country liquor.

CJI Lalit recommends Chandrachud's name as his successor to Govt

Chief Justice of India UU Lalit on Tuesday recommended to the Centre the name of the senior-most Supreme Court judge Justice DY Chandrachud as his successor. Justice Chandrachud, who has been part of several Constitution benches and landmark verdicts of the top court including on matters relating to the Ayodhya land dispute, right to privacy and adultery, will become the 50th CJI on November 9 once the recommendation is accepted by the Government.

Justice Chandrachud, who was elevated to the top court on May 13, 2016, will have a tenure of two years as the CJI and is due to retire on November 10, 2024. Setting in motion the process of appointment of the next CJI, the incumbent Chief Justice handed over the copy of his letter of recommendation to Justice Chandrachud, who is the son of the longest serving



CJI Y V Chandrachud. The former CJI was the head of the judiciary from February 22, 1978 to July 11, 1985.

On October 7, Law Minister Kiren Rijiju had sent a letter to CJI Lalit, who is set to retire on November 8, to recommend his successor. CJI Lalit will have a short tenure of 74 days. CJI Lalit, who wrote back to Rijiju recommending the name of Justice Chandrachud, requested all the judges of the apex court to assemble at the judges' lounge at 10.15 AM. He then handed over the letter designating the successor to Justice Chandrachud, who has also played a pivotal role in digitization of the judiciary.

K'taka CM, BSY start 'Jan Sankalpa Yatra' as Cong's Bharat Jodo on

In a political counter to the 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' of the Congress led by Rahul Gandhi, Karnataka Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai, along with the BJP stalwart BS Yediyurappa, on Tuesday started a 'Jan Sankalpa Yatra' in 52 Assembly constituencies in poll-bound Karnataka.

The 'Bharat Jodo Yatra', which began from Kerala, is undergoing its Karnataka leg. It would go on in the State till October 20. Karnataka will elect a new assembly in 2023. The BJP is Congress' main electoral opponent.

The BJP 'Yatra' is apparently inspired by the Congress' effort to revive itself across the country in the run-up to the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

Bommai and Yediyurappa are scheduled to cover 52 Assembly segments till December 25, as part of the 'Jan Sankalpa Yatra'. The 'Yatra' has started from Raichur

in the North-East Karnataka.

"The intention of the Jan Sankalpa Yatra is to inform the programmes, work and policies of BJP government in the state and at the Centre, and also send a message to BJP office-bearers and workers to prepare for elections with a resolve to bring BJP back to power in the state," Bommai said.

Speaking to reporters ahead of leaving for Raichur, he said, "There is enthusiasm everywhere. Through the Jan Sankalpa Yatra, we hope to gain the confidence of the people and to be victorious in the 2023 assembly polls."

According to the Chief Minister, during the tour, he will be interacting with beneficiaries of various schemes and visit certain places as planned by the local party functionaries.

Responding to a question, Bommai said he and his party are not worried about Congress' Bharat Jodo Yatra, and said the foot march has no



impact.

"The world knows, it is 'jodoing' (uniting) whom and 'thodoing' (dividing) whom. It has no importance. We are not worried. We are doing our sankalpa (resolution) yatra to win the election by informing people about our programmes. There is no connection with it (BJP's tour with Congress' yatra)," he added.

Incidentally, BJP's tour begins from Raichur Rural assembly segment, an ST reserve seat that has a huge presence of the Valmiki community.

The state government had last week decided to hike the reservation quota for SCs from 15 per cent to 17 per cent and for STs from 3 per cent to 7 per cent. The 'Valmiki Gurupetha' seer Prasannananda Swami has been on a hunger strike demanding the ST quota hike.

Bommai and Yediyurappa will be touring predominantly in the 'Kalyana Karnataka' region.

Of the 52 seats which they will be touring, 20 constituencies are currently represented by Congress MLAs and four by JD(S).

EC allots swords & shield symbol to Shinde faction

The Election Commission (EC) on Tuesday allotted "Two Swords and A Shield" as its symbol to the Eknath Shinde faction that was given the name Balasahebanchi Shiv Sena a day ago for the Andheri East Assembly bypoll, should it decide to contest the election scheduled for November 3.

In a letter to Maharashtra Chief Minister Shinde, the EC said it has decided to declare "Two Swords and A Shield" to be a free symbol and allot it to the candidate set up, if any, by the Shinde-led group in the current by-election.

Hours after the EC's decision, the battle of nerves for the bypolls began amid uncertain uncertainty whether the Shinde faction will field its candidate against the rival Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray).

The Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray), which was allotted Mashaal (Flaming

Torch) symbol on Monday, has announced that it would field Rutuja Latke as its candidate for the November 3 Andheri (East) Assembly bypolls. She is likely to file her nomination for the by-poll in the next couple of days.

The Andheri (East) bypoll has been necessitated by sitting Shiv Sena MLA Ramesh Late's death. Rutuja Latke is the widow of Ramesh Latke.

On its part, the Eknath Shinde-led 'Balasahebanchi Shiv Sena' - which has been waging a bitter battle with the Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray) for the original Sena's registered symbol 'Bow and Arrow' - has not officially announced as yet whether it would contest the Andheri (East) Assembly by-polls.

However, the ruling BJP - which is the senior alliance partner of the Eknath Shinde-led "Balasahebanchi Shiv Sena" in the Maharashtra government - has indicated that it may field Murji Patel as its candidate for the Assembly by-poll.

Jaishankar expresses concern over latest Russian military strikes on Ukraine

External Affairs S Jaishankar on Tuesday expressed concern over latest Russian military strikes in Ukraine on Monday and said "targeting infrastructure and causing deaths is not acceptable in any part of the world."

Making this assertion, he also reiterated the need for dialogue and diplomacy to end the conflict now on for more than eight months adding the ongoing violence is not helping anyone.

Addressing an event at Lowy Institute in Sydney, Jaishankar said the world is currently grappling with three key challenges of Covid, Conflict and Climate change.

He said this conflict is



hurting a large part of the world today because the daily lives of the people are impacted in a very, very damaging manner. "And these countries with whom we identify ourselves most of these countries and they are actually feeling frustrated because they feel that their problems are being neglected," the minister said.

Jaishankar's comments came a day after India voted to reject Russia's demand for a secret ballot in the UN General Assembly on a draft resolution

to condemn Moscow's "illegal" annexation of four regions of Ukraine. India favoured a public vote on the text along with over 100 other nations.

On Monday, India's External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said in New Delhi the escalation of hostilities was in no one's interest and noted that India stood ready to support all such efforts aimed at de-escalation of the situation.

The Indian embassy in Kyiv cautioned its citizens to avoid non-essential travel to and within Ukraine. India has not yet condemned the Russian military action and maintained that the crisis must be resolved through diplomacy and dialogue. India has abstained on votes on the Ukraine conflict in the UN General Assembly and the Security Council.

India, Australia Defence ties ensuring free, open Indo-Pacific region, says Minister

Defence ties between India and Australia has contributed significantly to ensure a free and open Indo-Pacific region, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Tuesday. His remarks came in the backdrop of China's growing belligerence in the region.

Japan, US, Australia and India are part of Quad grouping for the Indo-Pacific and conducted joint maritime exercises in the region in the last few years. China has objected to the formation of the Quad claiming it will lead to militarization of the Indo-Pacific.

On a two-day visit to Australia, Jaishankar said India and Australia's defence, secu-

city collaboration has contributed significantly to a free and open Indo-Pacific. He had an instructive morning with the Australian Armed Forces. Jaishankar had met Australian Defence Minister Richard Marles on Monday in Canberra.

"Spent an instructive morning with the Australian Armed Forces. Our defence and security collaboration contributes significantly to a free and open Indo-Pacific," he tweeted along with a picture.

Addressing a joint press conference with his Australian counterpart Penny Wong, Jaishankar on Monday said he had a 'very useful, very productive and very comfortable discussion' on a range of bilateral and global issues.

Wong said Australia and India have recognised that

the Indo-Pacific region is being "reshaped" both economically and strategically and underlined that the partnership with India is a "critical part" of shaping the region.

"We can only build and sustain the region we want by working with others, including by working in partnership with India and for Australia, this partnership is a critical part of shaping the region we want," Wong said.

Jaishankar received a warm 'Tiranga welcome' on his visit to Australia on Sunday as India's tricolour lit the country's old Parliament House in Canberra.

This is his second visit to Australia this year. The first visit was in February 2022 when he attended Quad Foreign Ministers' Meeting in Melbourne.

Congress demands action over hate speeches by BJP MP and MLA

The Congress on Tuesday demanded immediate action over the alleged hate speeches by BJP MP Parvesh Verma and BJP MLA Nand Kishor Gurjar, and urged the Supreme Court to issue directives after taking cognisance of the matter.

The party sought to know why Prime Minister Narendra Modi is silent on the issue and hoped that at least Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal will gather the courage to speak for the people of the city. Several purported videos of inflammatory speeches made at the 'Virat Hindu Sabha' have come up online.

An FIR has been filed

against the Vishva Hindu Parishad (VHP) and the other organisers of the Sunday event in Delhi, where certain speakers, including the two BJP MLAs, allegedly delivered hate speeches. The case was filed for allegedly holding the event without permission.

"Parvesh Verma has been caught on camera asking for a boycott of a certain community. He also incited hatred, so did Gurjar one of the BJP MLAs from UP, Ghaziabad. Nothing has been done, what is the police waiting for, why is PM not speaking. Why have the courts not taken cognisance, what is Mr Arvind Kejriwal doing, and if this is not hypocrisy then we wonder what is," Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinate said at AICC



press conference.

"Over 72 hours later, a citizens committee report is out on the Delhi riots of 2020 and it 'nails the role played by the media, and agencies, the way police looked the other way and how perpetrators of violence have gone scot-free", Shrinate claimed.

"We hope courts will take cognisance, police will act, the

PM will speak and hopefully Arvind Kejriwal will gather the courage to speak for the people of Delhi that he represents", Shrinate said.

Since hate speech is in focus, the Supreme Court must take suo-motu cognisance of the matter and issue directives, she said. Till when will the country continue to burn in this hate being spread, she asked.

Congress counters PM's claim that J&K issue not resolved by Nehru

The Congress on Tuesday countered the claims of Prime Minister Narendra Modi that the issue of Jammu and Kashmir was not resolved by India's first PM Jawaharlal Nehru.

Even though Modi did not mention's Nehru name in his speech, the Congress blamed Maharaja Hari Singh, the then ruler of the J&K, for not acceding to India soon after Independence and taking the decision only after invaders from Pakistan tried to take over the place.

PM Modi in a veiled attack on Nehru on Monday said Sardar Patel resolved issues of merger of other princely states,



but "one person" could not resolve the Kashmir issue. While addressing a rally in Gujarat, Modi targeted the first PM without naming him, and said, "Sardar saheb managed the merger of all the princely states with India but another person handled this one issue of Kashmir," he said adding that is why it still is unresolved. Modi said he is following Patel's footsteps.

Congress General Secretary in-charge of the Communication department

Jairam Ramesh cited Rajmohan Gandhi's book and said, "The PM has once again white-washed REAL history. He overlooks the following facts only to castigate Nehru on J&K. All this has been documented well in Rajmohan Gandhi's biography of Sardar Patel. These facts are also known to the PM's new man in J&K."

Jairam was referring to Ghulam Nabi Azad, who resigned from the Congress and formed a new political party. "Maharaja Hari Singh dithered on accession. There were dreams of independence. But when Pakistan invaded, Hari Singh acceded to India. Sardar Patel was okay with J&K joining Pakistan till Sept 13 1947 when the Nawab of Junagadh acceded to Pakistan."

Jairam said.

But Jairam pointed out that, "Sheikh Abdullah championed accession to India entirely because of his friendship with and admiration for Nehru, and his respect for Gandhi."

Jairam quoted from Rajmohan Gandhi's book — 'Patel: A Life' by Rajmohan Gandhi page 439 and page 591 (1991). "Vallabhbhai's lukewarmness about Kashmir had lasted until September 13 1947. That morning, in a letter to Baldev Singh, he had indicated that "if (Kashmir) decides to join the other Dominion," he would accept the fact. His attitude changed later that day when he heard that Pakistan had accepted Junagadh's accession".



India delivers another batch of essential medicines, medical items to Afghanistan

Continuing its humanitarian assistance, India on Tuesday delivered another batch of aid comprising essential medicines and medical items to Afghanistan.

India has, so far, supplied 45 tons of medical assistance in 13 batches to Afghanistan in the last few months, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), said here.

It said the aid was in continuation of India's "special relationship" with the people of Afghanistan and in view of the urgent appeals made by the United Nations to assist them.

"India has supplied the 13th batch of medical assistance consisting of essential medicines and medical/surgical items like Pediatric Stethoscope,

Sphygmomanometer mobile type with pediatric BP cuff, infusion pump, drip chamber set, electro cautery and nylon sutures," the MEA said. The consignments were handed over to authorities of the Indira Gandhi Children Hospital in Kabul.

The ministry also said till now India has supplied almost 45 tons of medical assistance, which included essential life saving medicines, anti-TB medicines, 500,000 doses of COVID vaccine, medical and surgical items.

Floods hit 33K in Assam, Arunachal

Heavy rain in various parts of Assam and adjoining Arunachal Pradesh has led to the inundation of several areas in Assam, affecting over 33,000 people, an official bulletin said on Tuesday.

The Regional Meteorological Centre, Guwahati, has forecast more rain over the next two days, which may further deteriorate the situation.

An Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) in its flood bulletin said Dhemaji, Lakhimpur and Dibrugarh districts have been affected by the rain that lashed the state since Monday.

Altogether 33,836 people in 46 villages under eight revenue circles of these three districts are currently reeling under the calamity.

Though no relief camps have been opened yet, six relief distribution centres are functional in Dhemaji district.

An embankment at Naoboicha in Lakhimpur district has been affected, while roads in Lakhimpur and Dhemaji have been damaged,

as per the ASDMA report.

Reports of erosion from Bongaigaon, Dhemaji, Dibrugarh, Morigaon and Sonitpur districts have also been received. The ASDMA bulletin also said the Brahmaputra river is flowing above the danger level at Nematighat in Jorhat district.

The Regional Meteorological Centre, Guwahati, said that rain with thunderstorms and lightning is likely to occur in various places in 21 districts of the state till

Wednesday.

The state had witnessed one of the worst deluges earlier this year, with floods and landslides claiming 199 lives so far. Almost every year, three to four waves of flood ravage Assam.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah last week asked the Assam government to devise a long-term plan to protect the northeastern state from flood for decades so that more development can take place without the fear of flooding.

3 held for human sacrifice of 2 Kerala women for lucre

Bhagawal Singh, a CPI(M) leader from Elanthur in Pathanamthitta district along with his wife Laila and a local goon by name Mohammed Shafi were arrested by the police on Tuesday in connection with the murder of two women as part of a sorcery ritual.

Rosely (57) and Padmam (50), two women who were lottery ticket sellers at Kaladi and Ernakulam were kidnapped by Shafi and murdered by the trio to propitiate Goddess Luck so that the couple would be blessed with all prosperity.

Shafi, the mastermind behind this act played the role of kidnapper as well as that of a sorcerer. He hoodwinked the two hapless women as well as the couple by disguising himself as the sorcerer.

According to Police, Shafi sexually abused the two victims and Laila before the gruesome act. He also took millions of rupees from the CPI(M) leader and his wife to arrange the victims.

Shafi, hailing from Perumbavoor and a drug pusher, has been staying at Ernakulam and was involved in many criminal activities. He



sweettalked Rosely who was staying away from her family into believing that she stands to make millions by acting in pornographic films.

It was with the dream of acting in movies and earn easy money that she accompanied Shafi to Pathanamthitta in the month of June 2022. Her neighbours in Kaladi said they have not seen her since the day she left for Pathanamthitta.

Rosely was murdered and her dead body was cut into pieces and buried in the compound adjacent to Bhagawal Singh's residence in June itself.

Even after two months, the Singh -Laila couple did not get the treasure or prosperity, Shafi told them that their fam-

ily was under a curse and they should conduct one more sorcery and human sacrifice. Shafi himself arranged to bring a victim and took more money from the couple.

The second victim Padma was picked up from Ernakulam and he took her to Elanthoor. Padma too was murdered, her body cut into pieces and buried adjacent to the spot where Rosely's remains were buried.

The police launched the investigation following a "missing person" complaint filed by the sister of Padma with the Kochi Police.

The police followed the mobile phone calls made and received by Padma before she disappeared.

Netaji's demise casts shadow on model of secular politics

The demise of Mulayam Singh Yadav has cast a shadow on the model of secular politics painstakingly crafted by him over the last three decades. Besides championing the cause of the OBCs and underprivileged class, Mulayam was also known for the important model of secular politics which went beyond lip service and involved forging of social coalition between OBCs and Muslims at the grass-roots level, fighting the inherent contradictions.

Ever since the unlocking of the Babri mosque on February 1, 1986 following the orders of the Faizabad district and session judge, Mulayam led the war of secularism from the front. Mulayam could foresee the politics of the coming years as the Congress was steadily losing ground over the unlocking of the mosque.

As expected, the Ram Janmabhoomi agitation was at its peak during Mulayam's first tenure as the chief minister (1989-1991). Police opened fire twice on the 'kar sevaks' mobilised by the Vishwa Hindu



Parishad (VHP) in October/November 1990.

Mulayam, who was determined to protect the Babri mosque, defended the police firing. He became the cynosure of Muslims across the country, particularly Uttar Pradesh.

At the height of the mobilisation by the VHP in 1990, Mulayam was invited by the Khilafat committee for a grand reception in Mumbai (Bombay then). The committee had led the Khilafat movement in 1920 for the restoration of the Ottoman Empire in Turkey, which was defeated by the British and allied forces during the First World War.

Mulayam, labelled as "Mullah Mulayam" by the Sangh Parivar in the 1990s, provided Muslims of Uttar Pradesh a sense of security at a crucial time.

TMC jolted after ED arrests MLA Bhattacharya

RK and DD are the two initials that have been doing the rounds in Bengal political circles within hours of the arrest of Trinamool Congress MLA and former Bengal primary education board chairman Manik Bhattacharya.

In a major blow to the Mamata Banerjee Government the Enforcement Directorate in the wee hours of Tuesday arrested Bhattacharya after a lengthy grilling, sources said adding his replies to a number of questions were unsatisfactory.

According to sources the ED has found two initials from the chat list of Bhattacharya. In one of such chats the TMC MLA is allegedly writing to one RK about the list of finalised candidates whose names have been approved by one "DD."

Bhattacharya's arrest comes months after the arrest of former Bengal Education Minister Partha Chatterjee, and other top official including North Bengal University

Vice Chancellor and former State School Services Commission Chairman Subires Bhattacharya, former West Bengal Board of Secondary Education Chairman Kalyanmoy Ganguli and SP Sinha a covenor of an empowered advisory committee created by the Government to advise the SSC on questions of appointments.

Court cases that were being heard in Calcutta High Court have revealed large scale bungling in school level recruitment where thousands of posts were sold to undeserving candidates at the cost of those who had successfully cleared the selection tests.

Lakhs changed hands through an elaborately created network of "field agents, collectors, liaison persons," who collected money anywhere between ₹10 and ₹20 lakh — depending on the level of jobs — from the candidates and transported the cash upwards. In turn those candidates were required to submit blank OMR sheets. These OMR sheets were later filled up by appointed persons.

Non-bailable sexual abuse case against Kerala Cong MLA filed

Within hours of the arrest of a local CPI(M) leader, his wife and an associate in connection with the gruesome murders of two women as part of human sacrifice, a Congress MLA in Kerala has landed himself in trouble over a case of sexual assault.

Police in Thiruvananthapuram has filed a non-bailable case against Kunnappilli under various sections of the Indian Penal Code dealing with sexual assault, violation of the modesty of women and kidnapping. According to police officials, they have taken the statement of the woman and the case would be transferred to the Crime Branch.

The incident shot into prominence when the MLA who represents Perumbavoor assembly constituency, was caught with the lady, a school teacher, in a resort in Kovalam. Both were having a wordy duel over Kunnappilli's relations with many women and the lady told him bluntly that she would file a police complaint of he continued tormenting her. It



is also reported that the MLA assaulted her and threatened her with dire consequences through his personal assistant.

The lady got her complaint filed as a statement in front of a magistrate in the capital city. Her relations had filed a missing person complaint with the police as she remained untraceable for a few days. She had disclosed the reasons behind her disappearance in the Statement filed with the magistrate. She also said in the statement that Kunnappilli had offered her Rs 30 lakh if she withdraws the complaint and the statement.

Kunnappilli remained incommunicado despite several attempts to contact him for his version of the incident.

ED arrests Sanjay Jain in money laundering case against IFFCO CEO

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday said it has arrested Sanjay Jain for channelizing 'proceeds of crime' from foreign shores to India in connection with a money laundering probe relating to former IFFCO CEO US Awasthi.

The ED had initiated money laundering investigation on the basis of a case registered by CBI on May 17, 2021 against US Awasthi, MD and CEO, Indian Farmers Fertilizer Co-operative Ltd. (IFFCO), Pravinder Singh Gahlaut, MD, Indian Potash Ltd. (IPL), Sanjay Jain, brother of Pankaj Jain, President of Jyoti Trading Corporation and beneficial owner of other entities of Jyoti Group, Amarendra Dhari Singh alias AD Singh, senior vice president of Jyoti Trading Corporation and others, for criminal conspiracy, cheating and criminal misconduct.

The allegations include receipt of illegal commission by the accused from the overseas suppliers through a complex web of fake commercial transactions through multiple entities registered outside India (controlled by the accused persons) to camouflage the fraudulent transactions as genuine.

"It is found that US Awasthi (father of Amol Awasthi & Anupam Awasthi) and Parvinder Singh Gahlaut (father of Vivek Gahlaut) wield considerable influence in the fertilizer industry by virtue of their position as Managing Director of IFFCO & Director of IPL (US Awasthi) and Managing Director of IPL (Parvinder Singh Gahlaut).

19-20 lakh cancer cases reported in India in 2022

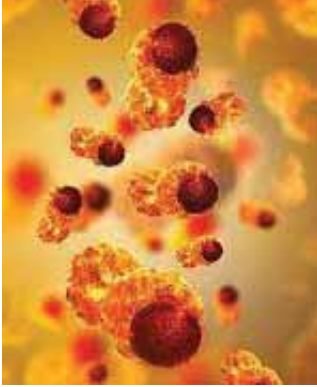
Real cancer incidence level in India is estimated to be 1.5 to three times higher than reported incidence as 51 per cent patients take more than a week to conclude diagnosis while 46 per cent take second opinion due to lack of confidence in initial diagnosis and suggested treatment, a report showed on Tuesday.

The reported cancer incidence in India in 2022 is estimated to be 19 to 20 lakh, whereas real incidence is likely to be 1.5 to 3 times higher than the reported cases, according to a study by

FICCI and EY titled "Call for Action: Making quality cancer care more accessible and affordable in India".

India is faced with a sizable cancer incidence burden, which continues to grow exponentially. The 2020 WHO ranking on cancer burden in terms of new yearly cases being reported had ranked India at the third position after China and the US, respectively.

"For cancer prevention, early diagnosis and widespread public awareness will be integral and will serve as a beacon of light to strengthen India's strategy for cancer care and other non-com-



municable diseases," said Ashok Kakkar, Chair, FICCI Task Force on Cancer Care.

"While some of the most cutting-edge cancer treatment methods and technology are available in our country, we still have a long way to go before we can ensure that cancer patients from every socioeconomic background receive the best possible care," added Kakkar, also Managing Director, Varian Medical Systems International India Pvt Ltd.

Cancer disease burden in India is characterized by poor detection with not more than 29 per cent, 15 per cent and 33 per cent of breast lung and cervical cancers being diagnosed in stages 1 and 2, respectively.

The cancer of the head and

neck are found to be progressing at a CAGR of 23 per cent, prostate cancer at 19 per cent, ovarian cancer at 11 per cent and breast cancer at 8 per cent, which is faster than the overall growth rate of incidence.

Six states, which represent 18 per cent of India's population, have 23 per cent share of the country's reported incidence burden and have the highest crude incidence rates.

Kerala, Mizoram, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Punjab, and Assam report the highest overall crude incidence rates of cancers which is greater than 130 cases per lakh population, the report mentioned.

Maha to hand over Palghar case to CBI

In a reversal of the decision taken by the previous Uddhav Thackeray-led MVA government to withdraw its general "consent" granted to the CBI to investigate the cases relating to Maharashtra, the Eknarsh Shinde-Devendra Fadnavis Government has indicated that it would hand over the investigations into the much-discussed Palghar lying incident to the CBI.

In the Palghar lynching incident that took place on April 16, 2020, two Sadhus and their driver were killed by an irate mob near Kasa town in Palghar district of Maharashtra.

In an affidavit filed before a trial court, the Maharashtra government said: "The petitioners have sought transfer of investigation to the CBI, in as much as according to them, it is imperative for achieving an impartial and independent investigation in the matter....The state of Maharashtra is ready and willing to hand over the investigation to the CBI and would have no objection for the same".

Welcoming the Shinde-Fadnavis government's readiness to hand over the probe to the CBI, state BJP spokesperson Ram Kadam said: "The Palghar incident was brutal and barbaric. The sadhus did

not get justice from the Thackeray-government. Thackeray spoke of Hindutva, however, he kept mum. Now, the government has decided to give it to the CBI. The Hindutva samaj is very happy today with the decision. We are committed to give justice to the sadhus".

Thanking Maharashtra deputy chief minister Devendsra Fadnavis, who holds the Home portfolio, Maharashtra-BJP Spiritual Front chief AcharyabTushar Bhosale, said: "What the previous government could not do, Fadnavis has done. The country is witnessing what has happened to former chief minister Uddhav Thackeray and

the then Home Minister Anil Deshmukh.

It may be recalled that on the night of April 16 2020, three persons were lynched by a 200-strong mob of villagers near Kasa town in Maharashtra's Palghar district on suspicion that they were thieves. The villagers first hurled stones at the van, prompting the driver to stop the vehicle. Later, they pulled three persons out of the vehicle and beat them to death in Gadchinchale village on Dabhadi-Khanwel road, with sticks and rods.

The deceased —identified as Chikne Maharaj Kalpavrukshagiri (70),


Sushilgiri Maharaj (35) and driver Nilesh Telgade (30) were travelling to Surat. Of them one was the diver, while two are residents of Kandivli in north Mumbai. The place where the incident took place is approximately 120 km from Mumbai.

As many as 251 adults and 16 juveniles are being tried on various charges of rioting, attempt to murder and murder in connection with the April 16, 2020 Palghar lynching incident which created public outrage across the country.

Till date, a total of 176 accused and 11 juveniles have been granted bail while the bail applications of 36 more have been rejected.

Monsoon woes

Our cities are drowning but our politicians indulge only in crass demagoguery and reckless populism

Withdrawal of the south-west monsoon has not just brought heavy rainfall in north India but also exposed the tall claims made by various governmental authorities that they are creating 'world class infrastructure.' Waterlogged roads (even arterial ones) and massive traffic jams plague not just Delhi-NCR but also other parts; continuous drizzle has been going on for several days. Plus, there have been reports about roads caving in. In the last week of September, a major part of the road at the Ifco Chowk in Gurugram caved in. Similar cave-ins were reported at Palam Vihar, Basai Chowk, Laxmi Garden, and the Khandsa Road, bringing the so-called Millennium City to a standstill. Incessant rain in the last few days in north India, including the NCR, has resulted in waterlogging in several parts. Mobility in Delhi and the adjoining areas suffered badly because of urban flooding. Schools and many offices were shut. There was an incidence of road cave-in at Noida Extension in Uttar Pradesh. Other parts of the country have also suffered a similar fate. Hyderabad got choked because of rains and the attendant problems. Continuous downpour was witnessed in the sub-Himalayan West Bengal and Sikkim, resulting in landslides at some places in Sikkim and road blockades.

Whatever happened to the world class infrastructure and the 'smart cities' programme. One is reminded of the infamous quote, "Let them eat cake," attributed to Marie-Antoinette, the queen of France during the French Revolution, as her response to the news that peasants didn't have bread. The powers that be of our country seem to have a similar attitude towards urban problems: 'Let them have slogans.' Choked roads, massive water-logging, and chaos are witnessed every year during the rainy season in Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Hyderabad, and smaller cities. But politicians of all parties, instead of addressing the real issues, continue to offer speeches, promises, and fantastic projects. The Smart Cities Mission is an example. A government website describes the vision as "Smart Cities focus on their most pressing needs and on the greatest opportunities to improve lives. They tap a range of approaches—digital and information technologies, urban planning best practices, public-private partnerships, and policy change—to make a difference. They always put people first." It went on to add that the objective is to promote cities that provide core infrastructure and give a decent quality of life to its citizens, a clean and sustainable environment and application of 'smart' solutions. That's very nice, but where are the solutions—smart or otherwise? The problems that Delhi, Hyderabad, and other cities are facing today are the ones that they faced last year, and before that every year. But politicians are concerned about such matters as the portrayal of Lord Hanuman in the teaser of a movie and the freebie of free travel to Ayodhya. Crass demagoguery and reckless populism are no substitutes for governance.

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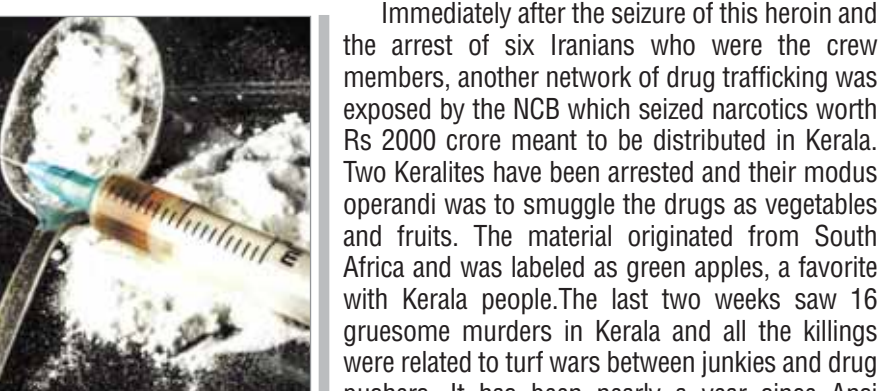


Players of Brazil celebrate after scoring a goal against Morocco in FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Bhubaneswar. PTI

Parakkum Kerala

Kerala has become one of the biggest hotbed of drugs and situation is deteriorating

The seizure of heroin and hashish oil costing more than Rs 2,000 crore off the coast of Kochi and from different places in Kerala during the last week shows how fast the menace of drugs has swallowed Kerala. Information from various de-addiction centers run by the State Government says that more than 4,000 youth have been admitted to these clinics to treat them from the octopus-like hold of narcotics. Last week a joint operation by the Indian Navy, Coast Guard, and Narcotics Control Bureau led to theseizure of 200 kg heroin from an Iranian dhow off the Kochi coast. It is reported that the stuff was seized from the periphery of Lakshadweep islands though the authorities are tight-lipped about the exact location. Initial investigation has proved that the drug reached Indian shores from Afghanistan via Pakistan.



Immediately after the seizure of this heroin and the arrest of six Iranians who were the crew members, another network of drug trafficking was exposed by the NCB which seized narcotics worth Rs 2000 crore meant to be distributed in Kerala. Two Keralites have been arrested and their modus operandi was to smuggle the drugs as vegetables and fruits. The material originated from South Africa and was labeled as green apples, a favorite with Kerala people. The last two weeks saw 16 gruesome murders in Kerala and all the killings were related to turf wars between junkies and drug pushers. It has been nearly a year since Ansi Kabeer, the 2019 Miss Kerala, and her colleague Anjana Shajan was found dead under mysterious circumstances after a late-night party in a hotel in Fort Kochi. The police are yet to make any breakthrough in the investigation while drug-related murders and deaths continue unabated in the State. Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan who unveiled a grandiose plan to tackle drug trafficking in early September is watching helplessly from the sidelines as the drug mafia-politicians-police cabal is getting flourished. The land is fertile for any kind of illegal activity. The State has the dubious distinction of being the pioneer in using radio pagers for the thriving flesh trade. B V Kumar, the former head of DRI had warned as early as 1989 that the dense forests in the Western Ghats are being used for cultivating cannabis. After Udda Punjab, it is the turn of Parakkum Kerala (Flying Kerala). Does anybody care?

Vishwaguru needs high HEI ranking

To make India 'Vishwaguru', Indian institutes must think global and gear up to compete with the best for higher global index (HEI)

Global rankings of Indian Higher Education Institutions trigger discussions that propel towards critiquing the system of ranking ascribing many negative impacts that it generates. The teacher-student ratio and the potential issues with inclusivity in the Indian context and the negative implications of the inefficient teacher-student ratio on the research publications of course problematise the notion of such global-level competition. However, these should not be excuses for academicians to seek relaxation or exemption from their professional development practices.

By bringing in the idea of inclusivity, ranting and raving about the need to focus on 'local' issues rather than on the 'global' competitive market, academicians/educationists are actually misjudging the needs of their 'customers'. Further, projecting education as a noble profession that creates "organic individuals" as argued by Patnaik and Laxminarayan in their commentary is bizarre because it assumes that education is unaffected and distanced from the worldly at the very time when the education system has to prepare student consumers to meet the changing demands of the 21st century.

Going global by enabling students to be global citizens is emphasised multiple times in the National Education Policy 2020. To ensure this global citizenship, the facilitators of education at all levels must function competitively. By forging ill-framed equations between academically privileged and underprivileged students and by neglecting the faculty's responsibility in enabling every student to compete in the global scenario, such educationists defending the local are in fact ignoring student needs. The student needs are not local, and neither are the solutions, opportunities, and prospects which are now irreversibly global.

The fear of being challenged by a minority of high-performance peers, as rightly pointed



out by the renowned academic Pramod K. Nayar, should not be the reason for evading the academic competition. A responsible academician must provide the students with valuable insights into the global-level challenges that they have to encounter once they walk out of the comfort zones of their HEIs. The competitive world that awaits the young graduates embodies the dictum: 'Survival of the fittest'. If the educationists themselves are not fit to survive, how will they enable the students to contest and win? Addressing the student needs is a mandate of any HEI. As part of the consumerist educational structure, if students look for institutions that are high in international or national ranking and if they focus on a subject-specific shortlisting of institutions, it signifies the responsibility of individual institutions to raise their standards which in turn demands that its faculty members compete with peers both locally and globally.

It is wrong if the faculty/teacher assumes that the institutions should focus only on local-level engagements and not entertain global-level competitions in the name of ensuring inclusivity and catering to the demands of those less privileged students.

RANKINGS SERVE AS A TOOL TO MEASURE THE ACADEMIC REPUTATION OF ANY INSTITUTION. HEALTHY AND MEANINGFUL ACADEMIC CONTESTS CAN HELP ANY INSTITUTE AND ITS FACULTY TO NAVIGATE TOWARD EXCELLENCE

Apprehensions about raising the level of academic challenge among students are pointed out as an issue. We underrate the students' abilities to cope with novelty. We must understand that the young generation is part of a knowledge revolution. Blanketing out these possibilities and giving them the impression that they need to meet only the local challenges is an incongruous notion that hinders the academic and economic progress of the young generation.

Many Indian institutions receive global-level funding. If this is not for enabling global citizenship, why should any agency fund these HEIs? There are many instances of students and academicians seeking international funding for their local-level projects. Would those preaching about the going local refuse global funding, visits, and collaborations even if such funding requires that they sell the local to the global academic marketplace like an ethnic product?

Being fearful of academic auditing, finding reasons to avoid competition with peers at local and global levels, and attributing the inefficient teacher-student ratio as the primary cause of lack of quality research and publication will not assist a nation to become a 'Vishwaguru'. In

fact, it does not even augur well for ordinary gurus, if we as teachers are so scared of upskilling our game!

Rankings serve as a tool to measure the academic reputation of any institution. Healthy and meaningful academic contests can help any institute and its faculty to navigate toward excellence. Engaging only on local-level concerns and focusing only on the shortcomings of the ranking system cannot resolve any of the issues that deserve immediate attention. Rankings influence students' decisions. To pursue higher education, they rely on the benchmark set by different ranking agencies. When the Indian policy documents underline the importance of preparing every student for global-level challenges by envisaging a transformation of Indian youngsters into global citizens, the faculty should embrace the idea of challenging themselves more to strive towards eminence and excellence.

Justice is not delayed or denied for some

Judiciary has a duty to be seen equal in treatment to all, and some getting speedy relief needs to be debated



It remains a question if quick relief by courts as seen in several instances is available to all citizens alike or otherwise. Are all being treated equally or some are more equal than others before the law is the question that requires an answer. Do some of these reliefs have any linkage to the appellant's capacity and capability to engage a more competent advocate?

Indian judiciary is best known in the world for its unique reputation of being a role model for its impartiality, fairness and independence and also as the one which treats a commoner and first citizen on equal footing. Several examples in this regard could be cited. But, somehow, it appears that somewhere something is missing and why it is so, one is unable to comprehend.

For instance, in 1969 VV Giri was elected as President of India and a petition was filed in the Supreme Court, urging that the election be set aside. Giri as President of the country in a rare instance appeared in person in court and was examined as a witness. On June 12, 1975, the Allahabad High Court passed a historical judgment disqualifying the then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi from holding public office for six years which of course was later stayed partially by the Supreme Court vacation judge on June 24, allowing her to continue as Member of Lok Sabha and also as Prime Minister. Interestingly, NA Palkhivala argued her case.

On October 12, 2000, former Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao was sentenced to three years' imprisonment by a trial judge but was later acquitted by the Delhi High Court in 2002. Former President Neelam Sanjiva Reddy had to resign as Chief Minister in 1964, following unfavorable observations made against him in the Bus Routes Nationalization case. Chief Ministers Lalu Prasad Yadav, J Jayalalitha were unseated following court judgements.

Indian judiciary is credited for rectifying wrongs done in its earlier judgment. For instance, the Supreme Court in January 2011 admitted that its decision during the Emergency was erroneous and violated the Fundamental Rights of the people of the people. The bench referred to the majority decision of the Constitution Bench in 1976, which became infamous as the Habeas Corpus case, in which four judges went with the then Congress Government view that even the right to life stood abrogated during Emergency. It was Justice HR Khanna who rightly gave a dissenting judgment by holding that issue of writs of Habeas Corpus by High Courts is an integral part of the Constitution and no power has been conferred upon any authority in the Constitution for suspending that power. This later resulted in Khanna being superseded to the office of the Chief Justice of India.

The Constitution is the law of the land and the supreme law in India. If any law passed violates the basic structure of the Constitution, the Indian judiciary has the power to nullify that law. This goes without saying that all citizens are equal before the law. But a critical observation gives rise to a doubt as to why the justice is quick and on fast track in few select cases whereas by and large it is slow, notwithstanding the reputation of the courts that they treat a commoner and first citizen on the same equilibrium.

From one side we hear about the huge pendency of the cases and from the other side we see disposals in the courts within hours of filing either in the form of a stay order or an interim relief or reversing the government orders or granting a bail etc. No doubt, the law has obviously provided for various forms of relief like Lunch motions, House motions, Habeas Corpus petitions, etc. However, the concept of restraining order is still underdeveloped and unclear under Indian law.

Why cases that were initiated decades ago on some individuals for which in numerous instances they were kept in jails as undertrials for a long period and were released on bail after rejecting several times in lower courts and higher courts are kept pending is not known. There are instances where some of these individuals on bail, contest elections and even occupy very high constitutional positions. Why such cases are not

decided either way is a million dollar question. As far as the civil disputes are concerned it is anybody's guess of their disposal. Quite often the judgement passed in a lower court, with several options provided for appeal is stayed in no time. The disputes at times take longer than the life of the petitioners. This reminds me of the proverb, 'Justice delayed is justice denied' which was taught for social studies' students.

The Indian Judiciary is a system of courts that interpret and apply the law in the Republic of India. India uses a common law system, first introduced by the British East India Company and with influence from other colonial powers and Indian princely states, as well as practices from ancient and medieval times. The Constitution provides for a single unified judiciary in India.

The judicial system is structured in three levels with subsidiary parts. The Supreme Court, also known as the Apex Court, is the top court and the ultimate appellate court in India. The Chief Justice of India leads that court. High Courts are the top judicial bodies in individual states, controlled and managed by state Chief Justices. Below the High Courts are District Courts, also known as subordinate courts, which are controlled and managed by District and Sessions Judges. The lower subordinate courts are Civil Court and the District Munsif Court, headed by a Sub-Judge. The higher subordinate

Criminal Court is headed by Chief Judicial or Metropolitan Magistrate. This gives abundant scope for the aggrieved in seeking justice.

There are five writ petition types in the Indian Constitution, which a citizen can file either before the High Court or Supreme Court. They are: Habeas Corpus, Mandamus, Certiorari, Quo Warranto, and Prohibition. The Constitution gives an extensive original jurisdiction to the Supreme Court in regard to enforcement of Fundamental Rights. It is empowered to issue directions, orders or writs.

A writ petition can be filed by any individual in the Supreme Court when Fundamental Rights have been violated by the State whereas a writ petition can be filed in the High Court when Fundamental Rights or any other rights have been violated by the State. Appeals in civil and criminal cases are made to the High Court against the decision of the subordinate courts. Supreme Court entertains matters in which interest of the public at large is involved popularly known as 'Public Interest Litigation' and several matters of public importance have become landmark cases.

The Indian judicial system undoubtedly is so greatly structured with several kinds of reliefs to the citizen giving him or her plentiful opportunity for redressal of any kind of injustice done. But something is missing is the feeling of a common man.

RTI rules need changes to make it more effective

Many irritants have cropped up in the RTI with visible unwillingness from some states to share information

RTI Act implemented on October 12, 2005 in initial years of its implementation had done wonders not only by exposing scams and scandals, but also resulted in systemic reforms. However, experience reveals that RTI rules (and not the RTI Act) need important modifications mainly to prevent misuse of the Act and minimising challenge to CIC verdicts in courts.

Precious time of Central Information Commission and courts should be saved through notification issued by central government to declare all public-private-partnerships, sports-bodies, cooperative-societies and other such bodies, public-authorities under RTI Act. Land and



Building Departments of central and state governments should study all cases of allotment of land or government-accommodations at subsidised rates or lease, and declare all these as public-authorities under RTI Act. For future, land or government-accommodations should be provided at subsidised rates on pre-condition of beneficiaries coming under purview of RTI Act.

Effective steps should be taken to prevent misuse of RTI Act, which will be a boon to genuine information-seekers by drastically reducing pendency at Information Commissions apart from saving man-hours and expenses for both the public-authorities and the petitioners.

Section 27 and 28 of RTI

Act give power to Competent Authorities and state-governments to draft their own rules which include fixing of RTI fees and mode of payment of RTI fees. Several Competent Authorities and states misused their power by having RTI fees as high as rupees 500. Several states fixed RTI fees for filing First Appeals also. However, the Supreme Court in its verdict dated March 20, 2018 on a petition filed by Common Cause imposed a capping of Rs 50 to be maximum RTI fees.

India should be governed with the principle 'One Nation—One Rule' in respect of RTI fees and its mode of payment by clubbing copying charges of first 20 copied with basis RTI fees of Rs 10

(for Central public-authorities), thus making Rs 50 as uniform RTI fees throughout the country inclusive of charges of first 20 copied pages. Making basic RTI fees at Rs 50 will largely prevent misuse of RTI Act just for sake of fun or publicity. There must not be any fees for filing First or Second Appeals.

Handling a postal order of value Rs 10 costs the postal department about Rs 50 with the cost of handling of postal orders by a public authority and bank clearing even extra. Most public authorities require postal orders in different names even though DoPT in its various circulars has required postal orders towards RTI payments to be in the name of Accounts

Officer only. These RTI stamps should be conveniently available at all post-offices and counters of public-authorities and other convenient sale-points.

Post-free RTI applications addressed to central public-authorities should be extended to all about 1,60,000 post offices rather than just about 4500 post offices presently. It is not difficult because every post-office, however small it may be, daily sends a post-bag to the Head Post Office with registered post, cash and unsold revenue-articles. This post-bag can carry post-free RTI applications received at the post-office.

Portal for filing online RTI applications should be modified so that RTI

responses and orders of First Appellate Authorities may also be auto-emailed rather than RTI applicants required to go to the portal for viewing of RTI responses.

DoPT should issue a circular in tune with para 23 of verdict dated November 2, 2012 in the matter "Fruit and Vegetable Union versus Unknown" (CWP 4787 of 2011) which requires ID proof compulsory to be attached with every RTI application, First Appeal and petitions filed with Information Commissions. Already the aspect has been adopted in Odisha apart from Punjab and Haryana.

Only websites uniformly designed by National Informatics Centre (NIC) should be mandatory for all

states. This has become necessary for states like Odisha have made online filing of RTI applications merely a mockery when it is compulsory to download online-filled RTI applications and then send it by post to concerned department.

Delhi High Court in its order dated August 8, 2018 in WPC 8278 of 2018 in the matter "Anil Dutt Sharma versus Government of NCT Delhi and others" mentioned – This Court is of the prima facie view that the Right To Information Act, 2005, would now override the Delhi Right To Information Act, 2001 as it would occupy the entire legislative field. DRTI Act has lost all relevance with RTI Act in existence.

More missiles, drones strike Ukraine

Russian forces strafed Ukraine with a fresh barrage of missiles and munition-carrying drones Tuesday, a day after widespread strikes killed at least 19 people in what the UN human rights office described as a “particularly shocking” attack that could amount to war crimes.

Air raid warnings extended throughout the country in the morning, sending some residents back into shelters after months of relative calm in Kyiv and many other cities.

The earlier lull had led many Ukrainians to ignore the regular sirens, but Monday’s attacks in the capital and 12 other regions gave them new urgency.

“It brings anger, not fear,” Kyiv resident Volodymyr Vasylenko, 67, said as crews worked to restore traffic lights and clear debris from the city’s streets.

“We already got used to this. And we will keep fighting.”

The Russian bombardment Tuesday struck both power plants and civilian areas, just as they did Monday.

One person was killed when 12 missiles slammed into public facilities in the southern city of Zaporizhzhia, setting off a large fire, the State Emergency Service said.

A local official said the missiles hit a school, residential buildings and medical facilities.

Energy facilities in the western Lviv and Vinnitsya regions also took hits.

Although officials said Ukrainian forces shot down an inbound Russian missile before it reached Kyiv, the capital region experienced rolling power outages as a result of the previous day’s deadly strikes.

The governor of the Mykolaiv region, Vitaliy Kim, urged residents to remain in bomb shelters as “there are enough missiles still in the air.”



The State Emergency Service said 19 people died and 105 people were wounded in Monday’s strikes. At least five of the victims were in Kyiv, Mayor Vitali Klitschko said. More than 300 cities and towns lost power, from the capital to Lviv on the border with Poland.

Beside the usual sirens, a new type of loud alarm that blared automatically from mobile phones jolted Kyiv residents early Tuesday.

A text message warning of the possibility of missile strikes accompanied the caustic-sounding alert. Russia’s widespread attacks came in retaliation for a weekend explosion that damaged a bridge linking Russia to the Crimean Peninsula, which Moscow annexed from Ukraine in 2014.

A spokesperson for the office of the U.N. High Commissioner for Human Rights said Tuesday that strikes on “civilian objects,” including infrastructure such as power

plants, could qualify as a war crime. “Damage to key power stations and lines ahead of the upcoming winter raises further concerns for the protection of civilians and in particular the impact on vulnerable populations,” Ravina Shamdasani told reporters at a U.N. Briefing in Geneva. “Attacks targeting civilians and objects indispensable to the survival of civilians are prohibited under international humanitarian law.”

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy was due to address the leaders of the Group of Seven industrial powers by videoconference Tuesday.

Germany, which currently chairs the G-7, announced the meeting after Monday’s missile strikes.

As Ukrainian forces grew increasingly bold following a series of counteroffensive successes, a cornered Kremlin ratcheted up Cold War-era rhetoric and fanned concerns it might resort to using nuclear

weapons in Ukraine.

Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov addressed the issue Tuesday, saying Moscow would only resort to that if the Russian state faced imminent destruction. Speaking on state TV, he accused the West of encouraging false speculation about the Kremlin’s intentions.

Russia’s nuclear doctrine envisages “exclusively retaliatory measures intended to prevent the destruction of the Russian Federation as a result of direct nuclear strikes or the use of other weapons that raise the threat for the very existence of the Russian state,” Lavrov said.

The director of British cyber-intelligence service GCHQ, Jeremy Fleming, told urged other officials to use caution about discussing the potential for such an escalation.

Speaking to the BBC, Fleming suggested his agency hadn’t seen any indications so far of Russia inching closer to using nuclear weapons.

Moscow’s barrage of missile strikes on cities all across Ukraine has elicited celebratory comments from Russian officials and pro-Kremlin pundits, who in recent weeks have actively criticized the Russian military for a series of embarrassing setbacks on the battlefield.

Russian nationalist commentators and state media’s war correspondents lauded Monday’s attack as an appropriate, and long-awaited, response to Ukraine’s successful counteroffensive in the northeast and the south and a weekend attack on a key bridge between Russia and Crimea, the prized Black Sea peninsula Russia annexed in 2014.

Many argued, however, that Moscow should keep up the intensity of Monday’s missile strikes in order to win the war now. Some analysts suggested that Russian President Vladimir Putin is becoming a hostage of his own supporters’ views on how the campaign in Ukraine should unfold.

“Putin’s initiative is weakening and he is becoming more



dependent on circumstances and those who are forging the victory’ (in Ukraine) for him,” Tatyana Stanovaya, founder of the independent R.Politik think-tank, wrote in an online commentary Monday.

Putin’s supporters have been calling for drastic steps on the Ukraine battlefield for weeks. These calls intensified over the weekend, shortly after an explosion on the Kerch Bridge linking Crimea to Russia sent shock waves around the globe. The bridge, Europe’s longest, is a prominent symbol of Russian military might and was opened by Putin himself in 2018.

“And?” Margarita Simonyan, head of the state-funded RT television, wondered on social media about Moscow’s response to the attack on the bridge.

Hong Kong nixes US sanctions on Russian-owned superyacht

Hong Kong’s leader John Lee said Tuesday he will only implement United Nations sanctions, after the U.S. Warned the territory’s status as a financial center could be affected if it acts as a safe haven for sanctioned individuals.

Lee’s statement Tuesday came days after a luxury yacht connected to Russian tycoon Alexey Mordashov docked in the city. Mordashov, who is believed to have close ties to Russian President Vladimir Putin, was sanctioned by the U.S., U.K. And the European Union in February after Russia’s invasion of Ukraine. Hong Kong authorities have said that they do not implement unilateral sanctions imposed by other governments.

“We cannot do anything that has no legal basis,” Lee told reporters. “We will comply with United Nations sanctions, that is our system, that is our rule of law,” he said. A U.S. State Department spokesperson said in a statement Monday that “the possible use of Hong Kong as a safe haven by individuals evading sanctions from multiple



jurisdictions further calls into question the transparency of the business environment.”

The State Department spokesperson also said the city’s reputation as a financial center “depends on its adherence to international laws and standards.” The \$500-million superyacht Nord, allegedly owned by Mordashov, moored in Hong Kong’s harbor on Wednesday following a week-long journey from the Russian city of Vladivostok.

Mordashov is one of Russia’s richest men, with an estimated wealth of about \$18 billion. He also is the main shareholder and chairman of Severstal, Russia’s largest steel

and mining company. Mordashov has tried to challenge the sanctions against him in European courts.

US and European authorities have seized over a dozen yachts belonging to sanctioned Russian tycoons to prevent them from sailing to other ports that are not affected by the sanctions. Russian oligarchs have begun docking their yachts at ports in places like Turkey, which has maintained diplomatic ties with Russia since the war began.

The Nord measures 141.6 meters (464.6 feet), has two helipads, a swimming pool and 20 cabins. The yacht is currently sailing under a Russian flag.


Ukraine war may be ‘blessing’ for climate, says weather chief

The head of the UN weather agency says the war in Ukraine “may be seen as a blessing” from a climate perspective because it is accelerating the development of and investment in green energies over the longer term — even though fossil fuels are being used at a time of high demand now.

The comments from Petteri Taalas, secretary-general of the World Meteorological Organisation, came as the world is facing a shortfall in energy needs — prompted in part by economic sanctions against key oil and natural gas producer Russia — and prices for fossil fuels have risen.

That has led some countries to turn quickly to alternatives like coal. But rising prices for carbon-spewing fuels like oil, gas and coal have also made higher-priced renewable energies like solar, wind and hydrothermal more competitive in the energy marketplace.

Worried UN meets on Ukraine hours after Russian strikes

The UN General Assembly started debating on Monday whether to demand that Russia reverse course on annexing four regions of Ukraine — a discussion that came as Moscow’s most extensive missile strikes in months alarmed much of the international community anew.

The assembly’s special session was planned before Monday’s barrage, but countries spoke out on the widespread, Monday morning rush-hour attacks that killed at least 14 people and wounded scores.

Ukrainian Ambassador Sergey Kyslytsya said some of his own close relatives were imperiled in a residential building, unable to take cover in a bomb shelter.

“By launching missile attacks on civilians sleeping in their homes or rushing toward children going

to schools, Russia has proven once again that it is a terrorist state that must be deterred in the strongest possible ways,” he said.

Russia said it targeted military and energy facilities. But some of the missiles smashed into civilian areas: a park, a commuter minibus, and more.

Russia has said it was retaliating for what it called a Ukrainian “terrorist” attack on Saturday on an important bridge, and Ambassador Vassily Nebenzia told the assembly that Moscow had warned that there wouldn’t be impunity for such an act.

The bridge was “civilian infrastructure, critical infrastructure,” he told reporters outside the chamber.

Ukrainian officials haven’t confirmed that Kyiv was behind the bridge attack or other incidents of apparent sabotage but have said they welcome setbacks for Russia in all territory that it has



claimed to annex.

UN Secretary-General António Guterres was “deeply shocked” by the Russian attacks and spoke Monday with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, said UN spokesperson Stephane Dujarric.

Various nations also deplored the bombardment. Turkish UN Ambassador Feridun Sinirlioglu,

whose country helped the UN broker a July deal to get Ukrainian and Russian grain exports flowing, called Monday’s attacks “deeply worrying and unacceptable.”

Costa Rican Ambassador Maritza Chan Valverde said the strikes showed “continued and complete disdain for human rights, humanitarian law and international norms.”

Hours after the missiles flew, the UN assembly gathered to consider responding to Russia’s purported absorption last month of Ukraine’s Donetsk, Luhansk, Kherson and Zaporizhzhia regions.

The move followed Kremlin-orchestrated “referendums” that the Ukrainian government and the West have dismissed as sham votes conducted on occupied land amid warfare and displacement.

A proposed assembly resolution would demand that Moscow

“immediately and unconditionally” scrap its supposed annexations and call on all countries not to recognise them.

The measure, spearheaded by the European Union, also would insist upon the immediate, complete and unconditional withdrawal of Russian forces from all of Ukraine’s internationally recognised territory.

Russia’s ambassador decried the debate as a one-sided exercise in pushing an anti-Russian narrative.

“Such cynicism, confrontation and dangerous polarization as today we have never seen in the history of the UN,” Nebenzia said.

He reiterated his country’s claim that the “referendums” were valid and that Moscow was endeavouring to “protect” people in the regions against what the Kremlin views as a hostile Ukrainian government.

Crimean Bridge blast: Experts assess damage

The bridge

Early on Saturday, local time, a massive blast shook the Crimean Bridge (also known as the Kerch Bridge). Shocking images of the burnt rail bridge and collapsed road bridge have been shown around the world.

But Russia has moved quickly to return the bridge to operations, even though it appears to be significantly damaged.

Observers have been left wondering: what was the effect of the blast and fire on the surviving bridge elements, what repairs could be required, and when is it safe to re-open a bridge after such an event?

As experts in bridge safety and blast engineering, we have (some) answers.

Built by Russia at a cost of some US\$3.7 billion after the annexation of Crimea in 2014, the Crimean Bridge is Europe’s longest, linking Russia to Crimea across the Kerch Strait.

The 19-kilometre connection is a vital artery for economic and social links, and since Russia’s invasion of Ukraine it has also become a critical military asset for Russian supplies and telecommunications.

Despite the name, the Crimean Bridge is actually two bridges: one for road and one for rail. The road bridge is itself two


independent bridge structures, while the rail bridge is a single bridge structure supporting two ballasted rail tracks.

Some general drawings and information on the bridge are available online.

The attack

The attacked section lies between Tuzla Island and Kerch, Crimea, on an east-west heading, and is midway between the island and the main arch span over the navigable waterway.

At this point the rail and road bridges are of a similar form of construction, known as a “composite slab orthotropic deck steel plate girder bridge”, spanning about 64 metres. This means there is a 20 centimetre concrete slab cast onto flat steel plates, stiffened with steel ribs, all supported by about 3.2 metre deep steel plate girders.

Hardeep Puri launches Offshore Bid Round

Promises transparency, efficiency to investors

Union minister Hardeep Singh Puri on Monday launched the Offshore Bid Round offering and assured transparency, efficiency and ease of doing business to investors.

In a keynote address to industry leaders in Houston, the Union Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister described the initiatives taken by his Ministry in accelerating the exploration and production activities in India.

Puri also gave his views on the importance of Coal Bed Methane in increasing India's domestic production and reducing the country's import burden.

He launched the Special CBM (popularly known as Coal Seam Gas) Bid Round - 2022 for International Competitive Bidding on Monday at Houston.

Simultaneously, Puri launched the Offshore Bid Round offering 26 blocks -- 18



carved out by DGH and eight as a result of expression of interests (EoI) from potential investors — covering an area of approximately 2.3 lakh Sq. Km.

Out of 26 blocks, three blocks based on EoIs are onshore covering an area of only 3,666 sq km, a media release said.

India, which is the third largest energy consumer in the world, is likely to have one of the fastest growing energy demands in coming years.

The Narendra Modi government has set a vision to make India a gas-based economy, by increasing the share of

gas in the energy mix. The importance of domestic gas in the energy basket is extremely crucial considering the uptrend in gas demand, price, and rising import bills, the minister noted. A step towards meeting this demand growth and reducing the hydrocarbon import dependency, India has made "transformational reforms" during the recent years since the formulation of Policy of CBM.

These investor-friendly policy reforms have made the CBM sector an attractive investible opportunity, the official release said.

Markets extend losses for 3rd day as global risks weigh

Nifty ends below 17k

Market benchmarks closed deep in the red on Tuesday, mirroring a negative trend overseas as tightening monetary policy globally and escalation of the war in Ukraine continued to weigh on sentiment.

Sliding for the third straight session, the 30-share BSE Sensex slumped 843.79 points or 1.46 per cent to settle at 57,147.32.

The broader NSE Nifty tumbled 257.45 points or 1.49 per cent to end at 16,983.55. IndusInd Bank was the biggest laggard among the Sensex constituents, dropping 3.70 per cent, followed by Nestle India, Tata Steel, Infosys, HCL Tech, Tech Mahindra, Dr Reddy's, and HUL.

Only two counters managed to close with gains — Axis Bank and Asian Paints, rising up to 1.15 per cent.

"Investors are becoming risk-averse due to rising geopolitical turmoil as well as worries about the global economic slump. Investors' caution ahead of the announcement of infla-



tion data prevented a better-than-expected start to IT earnings from improving market mood.

"However, as compared to global counterparts, domestic selling is not as aggressive since FII selling is primarily absorbed by DIIIs," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services.

The country's largest IT services exporter TCS on Monday reported an 8.4 per cent growth in its September quarter net profit at Rs 10,431 crore, while revenues jumped 18 per cent to Rs 55,309 crore.

"Indian markets are caught in the web of global turmoil. While domestic investors are fighting hard to come out of this web, they have been unable to do so amid high volatility with Nifty falling below its key psychological levels of 17,000.

India, UAE discuss mechanism for carrying out bilateral trade in national currencies

India and the UAE have held discussions on creation of a mechanism for carrying out bilateral trade in national currencies, an official statement said on Tuesday.

It was discussed during the 10th meeting of the UAE-India High Level Joint Task Force on Investments, held in Mumbai.

It was co-chaired by Piyush Goyal, Minister of Commerce and Industry, and Sheikh Hamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Member of the Executive Council of the Emirate of Abu Dhabi.

Referring to the ongoing discussions between Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and Central Bank of the United Arab Emirates on Unified Payment Interface (UPI) as a common digital payments platform, both sides agreed to continue discussions, it said.

"An important area discussed was the creation of a mechanism for carrying out bilateral trade in national currencies," the statement added.

The two delegations also reviewed the status of the negotiations of the India-UAE Bilateral Investment Treaty.

Twelve rounds of negotiations have been conducted till date.

Both sides noted that much progress could have been achieved since the commencement of the negotiations, and therefore reiterated their commitment to accelerate the



process for an early conclusion of a balanced and mutually beneficial agreement," it said.

Discussions also took place on ways of enhancing bilateral investments in key sectors like food security, manufacturing, infrastructure, energy and technology.

"In this context, it was agreed that the concerned authorities in both countries will explore establishment of efficient and integrated Single Window Solutions and Virtual Trade Corridors to reduce costs and time involved in trade and investment related procedures," it added.

Further, it said as a means of encouraging increased investment flows by UAE's sovereign investment entities into India, the two sides reviewed UAE's request with

respect to providing tax incentives to certain sovereign investment entities under existing UAE-India Tax Treaty, and India's response to provide the same under the existing domestic tax laws.

It was agreed that the Indian side will provide the necessary support to UAE Fast Track Mechanism in India to ensure speedy resolution of pending issues and difficulties experienced by a number of UAE companies and banks operating in India.

It was also agreed that a similar India Fast Track Mechanism would be set up in the UAE immediately to resolve issues pertaining to the Indian investors in the UAE, and to assist Indian companies in market entry and expansion when investing in the country.

Rupee rises 19 paise to close at 82.21 against US dollar

The rupee consolidated in a narrow range and settled 19 paise higher at 82.21 (provisional) against the US dollar on Tuesday.

At the interbank forex market, the local unit opened at 82.35 against the greenback. It witnessed an intra-day high of 82.32 and a low of 82.41 during the session.

It finally ended at 82.21, up 19 paise from its previous close.

On Monday, the rupee slipped 10 paise to finish at a fresh lifetime low of 82.40.

"Rupee traded in a narrow range after hitting fresh all-time lows against the US dollar. Dollar has been gaining momentum in the past few sessions following better-than-expected non farm payrolls numbers from the US," said Gaurang Somaia, Forex & Bullion Analyst, Motilal Oswal



Financial Services.

Safe haven buying also led to an upmove in the dollar after Russia rained cruise missiles on busy Ukrainian cities on Monday.

On the domestic front, the inflation number will be important to watch which will be released on Wednesday.

"We expect the USD-INR (Spot) to quote in the range of 82.20 and 82.80," Somaia added.

The dollar index, which measures the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.03 per cent to 113.18.

DoT, Meity to hold joint meeting of smartphone firms, telecom operators to resolve 5G issues

Top officials of the DoT and IT ministry have called a joint meeting of smartphone companies, including Apple and Samsung, and telecom operators on issues related to provide smooth access to 5G services, a government official said on Tuesday.

While over 100 million subscribers in India have 5G-ready phones, many devices, including Apple, are not supporting the service at present.

"We shall be working together to ensure smooth rollout of 5G, including smooth onboarding of consumers," an official source told PTI.

A joint meeting of smartphone companies and telecom operators will be held on Wednesday at the Department of Telecom (DoT) office.

Secretaries of both the DoT and Ministry of Electronics and IT will chair the meeting to discuss teething 5G issues.

The agenda of the meeting includes a discussion around



enabling the handsets to start supporting 5G services on 5G networks in India.

Bharti Airtel is the only company to have commercially launched 5G services while Jio has started beta trials.

At the meeting, the authorities will discuss the intervention of handset manufacturers and telecom operators to release software updates for all 5G handsets and prioritise the software upgrade for the adoption of 5G in India.

According to an industry source, who did not wish to be identified, Apple is currently testing iPhone with Airtel and Jio to work on software updates that will give access to 5G services to consumers.

MFI loans decline in June qtr; NPA situation improves: Report

The June quarter witnessed a marginal decline in the overall microlending outstanding on a sequential basis, but there was an improvement in the asset quality, a report said on Tuesday.

There was a 0.2 per cent decline in the overall microfinance book to Rs 2.85 lakh crore during the three months to June when compared with the number as of March-end, the report by CRIF High Mark said. The micro loans were up 18 per cent when compared with the year-ago period, the report by the credit information company added.

The April-June quarter last year, which saw the devastating second wave of the pandemic, had led to a massive impact on microlenders both from loan growth as well as delinquency perspective.

The June quarter saw Rs 49,788 crore of loans being disbursed, which was 39.2 per cent lower than what was achieved by the industry in the preceding March quarter, but 88.9 per cent higher than the year-ago period, the report said.

The value delinquency for loans overdue for over 90 days reduced by 0.5 per cent on a sequential basis to 2.2 per cent at the end of the June quarter, and was down by 1.1 per cent when compared to the year-ago period, the report said. The average balance per unique borrower declined by 1.1 per cent on a sequential basis to Rs 46,400, while the average balance per account declined 2.1 per cent.

The report suggested that the decline in the MFI book was driven largely by a 0.8 per cent decline in the urban areas, while the rural markets saw a 0.2 per cent uptick.

India offers 26 oil, gas blocks in mega offshore round

India is offering 26 blocks or areas for finding and producing oil and gas in a mega offshore bid round, upstream regulator DGH said on Tuesday.

Simultaneously, 16 areas for prospecting for coal-bed methane (CBM) are also being offered in a separate round.

The "government announces the offer of 26 blocks covering an area of approximately 2.23 lakh square kilometers for exploration and development through international competitive bidding," the Directorate General of Hydrocarbons (DGH) said without giving timelines for bidding.

Out of the 26 blocks, 15 areas are in ultra-deepwater, 8 in shallow sea and 3 blocks are onland.

The bid rounds are being held under the 2016 policy,



called the Hydrocarbon Exploration and Licensing Policy (HELP), which was promulgated on March 30, 2016.

Since then, seven bid rounds of the Open Acreage Licensing Programme (OALP) have been concluded and 134 exploration and production blocks awarded. These blocks cover 2,07,691 square km of area across 19 sedimentary basins. An eighth round was launched in July, offering 10 areas.

Bharathi Cement sets up 2nd automated cement terminal to strengthen brand

Cement manufacturer C Bharathi Cement Corporation Pvt Ltd on Tuesday said it has inaugurated an automated cement terminal in Tamil Nadu, the second such facility in the country, as the company aims to strengthen the brand in the southern parts of the country.

The company in a statement here said it has unveiled a superior quality new generation green cement, QUICK-CEM to cater to the precast and hollow block segments in Tamil Nadu and Kerala markets. According to officials, the company inaugurated its first terminal in Mumbai in 2018.

Coimbatore is a fully-automated packing and distribution facility having a capacity of 0.75 metric tonne per annum and would be manned by 16 employees, the company said.

The new terminal was inaugurated by VICAT Group Chairman Guy Sidos, VICAT India CEO Anoop Kumar Saxena and Director-Marketing M Ravinder Reddy.

Corporation Pvt Ltd is a joint venture of France-based VICAT Group, which has 51 per cent majority stake in Indian operations of the cement manufacturer.

The terminal in Coimbatore will have dedicated container wagons and a 24-hour loading facility. The new facility is the first ever in the industry to have end-to-end logistic automation for transportation of cement in containers.

The Coimbatore facility is equipped with infrastructure for loading bags as well as bulk cement for serving Tamil Nadu and Kerala market, leading to enhanced customer service level and cost competitiveness in the region.

Reserve Bank allows SPDs to undertake all foreign exchange-related activities

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Tuesday allowed standalone primary dealers to offer all foreign exchange market-making facilities to users, a move aimed at providing broader facilities to customers for currency risk management.

At present, Standalone Primary Dealers (SPDs) are permitted to undertake foreign currency business for limited purposes. Currently, there are seven SPDs and 14 bank primary dealers in the country.

SPDs will also be permitted to take up trading and self-clearing membership with Sebi-approved stock exchanges and clearing corporations for undertaking proprietary trans-



actions in equity and equity derivatives market.

"...It has been decided to allow SPDs to offer all foreign exchange market-making facilities to users, as currently permitted to Category-I Authorised Dealers, subject to adherence to the prudential regulations and other guidelines...", the RBI said in a circular.

IDBI Bank sale: Corporates cannot be bidding consortium members due to RBI norms

Large corporates have been disallowed from being even a minority shareholder in consortium wanting to bid for 61 per cent stake in IDBI Bank, as the current RBI norms bar industrial houses from becoming bank promoters, an official said.

Currently, RBI guidelines allow industrial houses to hold a maximum of 10 per cent stake in private sector banks, but they cannot be a promoter.

Last week, the government along with Life Insurance Corporation (LIC) invited Expression of Interest (EoI) for selling 60.72 per cent stake in IDBI Bank. However, it barred large industrial houses from



participating in the strategic sale.

As per the bid document, 'large industrial/corporate houses' has been defined an industrial/ corporate group with assets of Rs 5,000 crore or more with the non-financial business of the group accounting for 40 per cent or more in terms of total assets/ gross income.

An official said that corporate houses have not been

permitted to participate in the bidding process for IDBI Bank transaction as the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) regulation clearly says that they cannot be the promoter entity in any bank.

"As per the IDBI Bank bid document, the consortium, if they emerge as the winning bidder, would be classified as the promoter. Allowing corporate houses as part of the consortium member would mean they are part of the promoter group which is not allowed as per RBI guidelines," the official said.

The RBI would be the final deciding authority on whether the interested bidder belong to a large industrial house or to a company connected to a large industrial house.

The spin trio of Washington Sundar (2/15), Shahbaz Ahmed (2/32) and Kuldeep Yadav (4/18) picked the right lengths on a slow Kotla pitch to bundle out South Africa for 99, the Proteas lowest ODI total against India.

The home team batters, led by Shubman Gill (49), chased a paltry 100-run target in 19.1

overs.

The series loss further jeopardised South Africa's chances of a direct qualification for the ODI World Cup next year.

Pacer Mohammad Siraj (2/17) too continued his good run to make a strong case for his inclusion in T20 World Cup squad.

While Washington and Shahbaz got wickets up front, left-arm spinner Kuldeep, who missed out on a hat-trick, cleaned up the tail.

The quality of the Indian white-ball squad was on full display in the series as the second-string team came from

behind to clinch the three-match series 2-1.

Chasing a small total, opener Gill attacked the South African bowlers from the very first ball while skipper Shikha Dhawan played second fiddle.

The Indians, who looked in a hurry to finish the match, lost a bit of momentum after the wickets of Dhawan, whose woe-ful run in the series continued as he was run out for eight, and Ishan Kishan (10).

However, Shreyas Iyer (28 not out) continued his stellar run as he whacked three boundaries and two sixes including a match-winning maximum to steer

India to victory after Gill was trapped leg before with three runs needed.

Earlier put in to bat, South African batters failed to impress, falling like ninepins.

Quinton de Kock (6) was the first to perish as he half-heartedly cut the ball to top-edge it to Avesh Khan at backward point, giving Washington his first wicket.

India then seemingly got their second wicket when Reeza Hendricks (3) was trapped leg before but the South African took the review to turn the umpire's decision in the seventh over.

Janneman Malan (15) smacked Siraj for three of boundaries in his consecutive overs before the pacer got rid of the opener as he tried to play the pull shot.

South African batters continued to struggle and looked off colour as Siraj claimed his second when he got Hendricks (3) next.

Aiden Makram (9), whose stay in the middle lasted 19 balls, became Shahbaz Ahmed's first victim as he nicked it through to the keeper Sanju Samson.

The visitors dallied to 50 in 17.1 overs but India were all over the visitors.

Skipper David Miller (7) and joined Heinrich Klaasen in the middle but he too couldn't make a mark as he was bowled, the ball slid in from round the wicket to clip the outside of off stump.

Brought into the attack in the 20th over, Kuldeep too joined the party as Andile Phehlukwayo failed to read his googy.

Klaasen and new-man Marco Jansen stitched a 22-run stand that included a four and a six to take South Africa closer to the 100-run mark.

First, Jansen charged down the pitch for a six over long on, a few balls later Klaasen hit a boundary but he was dismissed by Shahbaz.

Kuldeep then burst with a three-wicket haul clearing up the lower order as South Africa were bowled out in 27.1 overs.

In the men's 57kg featherweight category, Gujarat's Aasifali went down by unanimous decision 5-0 to Haryana's Sachin Siwach, who will be up against two-time CWG medallist Hussamuddin of the Services in the final.

However, it was heartbreak for multiple Asian championship medallist Shiva Thapa of Assam, who went down 2-3 in a close bout against Services' Akash. His statemates, Jamuna Boro (57kg) and Pwilao

Basumatary (60kg) also had to settle for the bronze medals.

Meanwhile, Maharashtra pugilist Nikhil Dubey got a great opportunity to pay his tributes to his coach Dhananjay Tiwari, who passed away in a freak road accident while travelling from Mumbai to watch his ward play the men's middleweight 75kg semifinal against Services' Sumit Kundu. Nikhil clinched the bout 4-1 to set up a title clash against Mizoram's Malsawmitluanga, who got the better of Goa's Puspender Rathee 5-0. Earlier, Asian championships bronze medallist Jasmine used her longer reach and nimble footwork to great effect against her lesser known Manipuri opponent Pravish Konthoujam to storm into the final with a 5-0 win in 60 kg category. Olympian Simranjit Kaur got rid of Assam's Pwilao in other semifinal.

Roger Binny files nomination for post of BCCI president, Shah likely to remain secretary

Roger Binny, a member of the 1983 World Cup winning team, on Tuesday filed his nomination for the post of BCCI President and is likely to get the top job unopposed, Board vice President Rajeev Shukla said.

Binny, 67, is so far the only candidate to have filed nomination for the post and if no more candidate emerges, he will replace Sourav Ganguly as BCCI chief when the Board holds its AGM in Mumbai on October 18.

After hectic parleys and back-channel discussions in the past one week, it was decided that Binny would be the 36th Board president, one of the sources familiar with the development, said.

Jay Shah, son of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, has also filed nomination and will continue as BCCI Secretary for a second consecutive term if no more candidate throws his hat in the ring.

Shah is also expected to replace Ganguly as India's representative at the all powerful ICC Board.

"Roger Binny has filed nomination for president's post, myself for the vice-president's post, Jay Shah for secretary, Ashish Shelar for treasurer and Devajit Saikia has filed nomination for joint secretary's post," Shukla told reporters.

"Arun Dhumal will head the IPL governing council and Abhishek Dalmiya will be part of that council. Khairul Jamal



(Mamun) Majumdar will be part of the Apex council. As of now these are the nominations and all are unopposed," Shukla added.

Wednesday is last day for filing nominations. Candidates can withdraw their nomination by October 14. The final list of candidates for various positions will be published on October 15.

Binny, though, is a surprise choice to head the BCCI.

However, hints were dropped that his name will emerge for a position when Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA) named him as its representative at BCCI AGM instead of secretary Santosh Menon. Binny is KSCA President and will have to leave his position in the state body.

The medium pacer was one of the architects of India's historic World Cup triumph in 1983. In eight games, he took 18 wickets, the highest in that edition of prestigious tournament.

Finn Allen and Devon Conway shared a 117-run opening partnership as New Zealand cruised to a nine-wicket win over Pakistan with almost four overs remaining on Tuesday in the Twenty20 Tri-Series.

Allen made 62 including a half century from 32 balls and Conway followed his match-winning 70 against Bangladesh on the weekend with an unbeaten 49 on Tuesday as New Zealand easily surpassed Pakistan's 130-7.

Conway underlined his importance to the Black Caps ahead of the T20 World Cup with consecutive unbeaten innings. Allen took a moment to judge the pace and bounce of the pitch at Hadley Oval, then went on to 62 from 42 balls with six sixes, marking himself as a player to watch when the world tournament starts later this month.

Pakistan and New Zealand are level in the series with two wins each from three matches, while Bangladesh is yet to win. The next match is between New Zealand and Bangladesh on Thursday.

New Zealand's win Tuesday was set up by the bowlers. Mitchell Santner conceded 11 runs from his opening over then joined with Michael Bracewell to uproot Pakistan's top order.



The pair combined to contain Pakistan's powerful batters, sharing four of the first five wickets.

Bracewell, who took 2-14 in New Zealand's eight-wicket win over Bangladesh on Sunday, bettered that with 2-11.

He claimed the first Pakistan wicket to fall, dismissing Mohammad Rizwan for 16. Rizwan fell in the manner of several Pakistan batters who made the mistake of trying to hit the ball down the ground.

BWF Rankings: Lakshya Sen rises to career-high eighth

Commonwealth Games gold medallist shuttler Lakshya Sen climbed one spot to be at a career-high eighth place in the latest BWF men's singles world rankings.

The men's doubles pair of MR Arjun and Dhruv Kapila also moved closer to top-20 by jumping two spots to be at a career high 21st in the list issued on Tuesday.

Two-time Olympic medallist PV Sindhu remained at sixth in the women's singles rankings while the pair of Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy is ranked eighth in the men's doubles section.

The 21-year-old Sen, who had won a bronze in the 2021 World Championships, has been in brilliant form, starting the year with a gold medal at the Yonex-Sunrise India Open before his runner-up finishes at the prestigious All England Open Championships and German Open.

He was also a key member of India's historic Thomas Cup triumph after 73 years.

The in-form duo of Arjun and Dhruv, on the other hand, has been making a steady rise in the rankings after they began the year in 42nd position.

China joins hands with SCO member states in promoting green development

In the golden harvest season of autumn, the wind turbines standing in rows against the wind at the foot of the Tianshan Mountains in Kazakhstan make a spectacular sight. These are the first batch of generating units of the Shelek Wind Power project jointly funded by Power Construction Corporation of China and Samruk-Energy Company of Kazakhstan, and now they have officially gone into commercial operation.

This is just a microcosm of China's cooperation with SCO member states in achieving green energy transition. Uzbekistan has introduced a salt-tolerant wheat variety from China. Kazakhstan has introduced Chinese dry-cultivated rice to its Balkhash Lake

region, saving more than 50 percent of water through the drip irrigation technology. In their pursuit of green development, the SCO member states are continuously increasing cooperation with China.

By the end of June 2022, China had invested more than US\$37.5 billion in SCO member states. At the beginning of this year, the China Development Bank launched the second phase of the RMB30 billion (US\$4.21 billion) equivalent special lending facility within the framework of the SCO Interbank Consortium to promote Belt and Road cooperation. Such lending will mainly cover projects related to modernization, connectivity, infrastructure, and green, low-carbon and

sustainable development.

Syed Shakeel Shah, Director of the Central Asia Regional Economic Cooperation (CAREC) Institute, said that China and other SCO member states see broad prospects for cooperation in addressing climate change and advancing the energy transition.

Snow leopards, known as "kings of the snowy mountains," can be seen in many alpine areas of the SCO member states. China, Kyrgyzstan, and other SCO member states have jointly implemented the Global Snow Leopard and Ecosystem Protection (GSLEP) Program. By 2021, the number of wild snow leopards in China had increased by 22 percent since

the early 21st century.

Restoring the ecosystem of the Aral Sea is also one of the environmental issues that the SCO is most concerned about. At the invitation of the Uzbekistani Ministry of Innovation and Development, the Xinjiang Institute of Ecology and Geography of the Chinese Academy of Sciences has set up a network of 80 automatic meteorology and water quality monitoring spots in the Aral Sea basin to provide a scientific basis for the decision-making on water resources management in the basin. The institute has also established an experimental base for restoration of saline land through revegetation in Moynaq Town on the shore of the Aral Sea, where more than 20 drought-enduring

and salt-tolerant crops with economic value are planted, such as desert cistanche and sea buckthorns.

"China has provided us with all-round help, covering equipment, technology, personnel training, and more aspects," said Ganiyev, former deputy director of the Aral Sea International Innovation Center. "We highly value this cooperation platform and hope to bring our cooperation to a greater depth."

Kranina, a senior researcher of the Center for China Socio-Economic Research, the Institute of the Far Eastern Branch of the Russian Academy of Sciences, said that China has taken a series of practical measures to develop green

infrastructure, green energy, green transportation, green finance. "China's rich experience in green and sustainable development is attractive to other SCO member states," she said.

Right now, the SCO region as a whole has shown a strong development momentum, as evidenced by the 12 percent annual growth of the total GDP of SCO member states and their trade. By 2020, the aggregate economic output and total foreign trade volume of SCO member states had increased by 11 times and 8 times respectively since the early days of the SCO. In 2021, the aggregate economic output of SCO member states exceeded US\$20 trillion.

Yunnan moves faster to build multi-level opening-up system

At Mohan railway station in Xishuangbanna Dai Autonomous Prefecture of Yunnan Province—the first station of the China-Laos Railway on the Chinese side, the customs control area is a lively sight, with trucks going in and out, loading and unloading. "Since the opening of the China-Laos Railway last December, the number of cross-border freight trains has increased from one pair per day to five to seven pairs per day," said Wang Junfeng, deputy head of Mohan Station.

Since 2012, Yunnan has moved faster to build a multi-level opening-up system. Particularly, it has promoted the connectivity of transportation infrastructure with neighboring countries. Ten years on, the Yunnan sections of the China-Vietnam, China-Laos, and China-Myanmar expressways have been successively completed, and the China-Laos railway has gone into operation as scheduled. The international shipping in the Lancang-Mekong River has seen steady development and achieved a zero breakthrough in container transportation. Now air routes basically connect

Yunnan with all capitals and key tourist cities of South and Southeast Asian countries.

In the past ten years, Yunnan has accelerated development of multiple opening-up platforms, such as the free trade pilot zone, economic and technological development zones, border and cross-border economic cooperation zones, integrated bonded areas and border ports. The province has increased the total volume of its imports and exports from US\$21.01 billion in 2012 to US\$48.66 billion in 2021 and cumulatively put US\$12.48 billion in foreign funds into use.

Yunnan is already trading with 200 countries and regions. In 2021, the trade between Yunnan and other Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) member states reached RMB140.7 billion (US\$20.12 billion). Located in southwest China, Yunnan province shares a borderline of more than 4,000 kilometers with Myanmar, Laos, and Vietnam. It is a gateway of China's opening-up to South Asia, Southeast Asia, and the Indian Ocean Rim.

Yanhanlu: I'll protect the Asian elephants all my life

Yanhanlu, leader of the Asian Elephants Observation and Protection Team in the Wild Elephants Valley Scenic Area of Xishuangbanna Dai Autonomous Prefecture, Yunnan Province, always considers it as his lifetime career to protect the Asian elephants. "I'm so lucky to be able to protect the Asian elephants. To protect them is to protect our ecological homeland," he said.

Yanhanlu became a forest ranger in the Wild Elephants Valley Scenic Area in December 1997. In the past 25 years, he and his colleagues have devoted themselves to observing and protecting the Asian elephants. They have made great contributions to promoting harmony between humans and elephants, conserving the biological diversity, and enhancing the influence of China in protecting Asian elephants as an international brand.

"I follow the elephants in the valley and rainforest every day, searching for the traces they leave, observing their living conditions, and monitoring their range of activities. I walk more than 10 kilometers a day," said Yanhanlu, now an expert at the living habitats of wild Asian elephants.

Yanhanlu has given a name to almost every member of the wild

elephants' family, such as Short Trunk, Broken Ear, and Big Naughty. "To distinguish the elephants, we name them according to their physical characteristics," Yanhanlu explained. He and his team members trek through the one-million-hectare virgin forest in the Mengyang Nature Reserve to keep track of the wild Asian elephants, giving security warnings and taking note of observation data.

Yanhanlu has participated in many operations to rescue wild elephants, but the rescue of a male adult wild elephant named Kun Six left the deepest impression on him. On February 19, 2010, Yanhanlu was about to get off work when he received a call. Having learned that

Kun Six was injured, he immediately packed up tools and medicines and rushed to the rescue. In estrus and injured, Kun Six was very irritable and hard to control. It would attack the rescuers every time they tried to approach it. After three days of relentless efforts, Yanhanlu and his team members finally managed to send Kun Six to the Xishuangbanna Asian Elephants Breeding and Rescue Center for treatment.

Over the past 24 years, because of the risks involved in the job, the Asian Elephants Observation and Protection Team have had a high turnover rate, but Yanhanlu has always chosen to stay. "I'll be a guardian of wild elephants all my life, and I hope that people from

all walks of life can pay more attention to wild Asian elephants," he said.



Wild Asian elephants are under first-grade state protection in China. They are mainly distributed in Xishuangbanna, Pu'er, and Lincang of Yunnan province. By the end of 2021, according to information released by the Yunnan Forestry and Grassland Bureau, the population of wild Asian elephants in Yunnan had increased by more than 60 to 360 from 293 in 2018. Yunnan coffee exports surge in both volume and value

In the first half of this year, Yunnan exported 18,000 tons of coffee beans, a year-on-year increase of 2.3 times. According to insiders, as the decrease in production in the world's major coffee producing areas and the drop of international shipping prices divert international orders to China, both the export volume and unit price of Yunnan coffee beans have increased significantly from the same period last year.

Gao Mei, deputy general manager of a coffee plantation in Pu'er City, Yunnan Province, is in charge of export business. Now she browses the prices of coffee futures on the New York Stock Exchange every day.

Gao said, "We export 80 percent of our coffee to the German market. This year, we have exported 3,100 tons of first-class Simao small-grain coffee, triple that of the same period last year, and the unit prices of our products have also increased. I'm quite optimistic about this year. The average price was 23.4 yuan (US\$3.28) per kilo last year, as compared to 32 yuan (US\$4.49) per kilo this year."

According to Gao, coffee beans are mainly exported by sea. Their company has exported significantly more coffee beans this year over the same period last year mainly because the sea transportation price dropped.

Also, the severe drought in Brazil and other major coffee-producing countries in South America has dealt a heavy blow to the coffee planting industry and caused a sharp decrease in the global supply of coffee beans, hence the surging prices.

Liu Haifeng, executive deputy general manager of a coffee trading center in Yunnan, said, "The market has shown a huge demand for Yunnan coffee since May. Many domestic and foreign customers inquire about the quantity, quality, prices, and grades of our coffee products every day."

From January to June this year, according to Chinese customs data, Yunnan has exported 18,000 tons of coffee beans to the European Union, ASEAN states, Americas, the Middle East, and other markets.

Yunnan is the main coffee producing area in China. Its coffee acreage, production, and output value account for more than 98 percent of the national total, and the coffee variety produced here is the world's mainstream small-grain coffee Arabica. Data from the Yunnan Provincial Department of Agriculture and Rural Affairs shows that Yunnan had a coffee acreage of about 92,666 hectares and produced about 110,000 tons of coffee beans in 2021.
