During a visit to the eastern England city on Thursday, the Indian-origin Cabinet minister was briefed by the Leicestershire Police chief and also leaders from local temples and mosques on the serious disorder which has resulted in 47 arrests. The disorder came as tensions since an India-Pakistan cricket match at the end of last month continued to spill over into

MICROPROCESSOR-CONTROLLED SMART LIMBS DEVELOPED BY ISRO

s a spin-off of space technology, Indian Space Research Organisation said on Friday that it has developed an intelligent Artificial limb. It is likely to be commercialised soon and expected to be cheaper by up to 10 times, benefitting above-knee amputees to walk with a comfortable gait, ISRO said. These microprocessor-controlled knees (MPKs) offer extended capabilities for the amputee than those offered by the passive limbs that do not use the microprocessors, ISRO said in a statement. "Thus far, a 1.6 kg MPK has enabled an amputee to walk about 100 metres in the corridor with minimum support. Efforts to improvise the performance are underway," it said.

ANKABABU RELEASED

Court issues show-cause notice to CID

In a setback to the State government, while releasing senior journalist Kollu Ankababu on Friday, the CID Court in Guntur issued a show-cause notice to the CID officials asking them to explain when they had issued 41(A) Cr.P.C. notice to him and in what circumstances. The Court also asked the officials to provide details of the period during which the CID tried to issue the

notice to the accused. The CID was also instructed to produce details on how they tried to give notice to the said journalist and how he refused, within four days.
Earlier, the CID officials

informed the court that they served the 41(A) notice to Ankababu, which was refused by him. Reacting to that, Ankababu said to the Court that, the CID did not give notice and arrested him illegally. Reacting on the allegations, the Court directed the CID to investigate the cases as per the legal procedure and released Ankababu.

Speaking on this occasion, Ankababu said that the CID police arrested him without serving notice or showing a warrant.

Thanking the journalist fraternifranking the Journalist fraternity for supporting him, Ankababu said that he did not commit any crime by forwarding the alleged message in WhatsApp. Before that, the journalist unions like APJF, APUWJ and others condemned the arrest and staged a protest at the CID office in Guntur. From there, the police shiftthe protesting journalists to Nagarampalem police station.

APJF General Secretary and Mahaa TV MD Marella Vamsi, APJF president Ch. Krishnanjaneyulu and others said that the arrest was undemocratic.

Meanwhile, in a press release, the CID said that based on a complaint lodged by Tirupati Ramesh, Manager, Chief Minister's Office, they lodged an FIR under sections 153(A), 505(2)



Uploading photos before and after submission of grievances mandatory

The State government has launched many a trailblazing scheme and procedure in the past three years. One such initiative is the practice of uploading photos of the grievances received before and after the 'Spandana' programme. This mandatory process has proved to be a huge success.

Sources in the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) say that the new procedure introduced in the 'Spandana' programme has been forcing the local officials to visit the citizens who raised the grievances, interact with them in person and understand the problem. If the grievance is not redressed, the aggrieved person would not allow the photo and hence it appears as 'pending' in the portal. All the grievances have to be redressed as per the guidelines laid

down in the citizens charter. The official machinery at the field

The dedicated 'Spandana' office at the CMO would monitor all the grievances across the State, from village level to State level, and instruct the district authorities concerned to redress them.



The leaders said that it was true that they gave money through cheques as party donations. They also made it clear that giving party donations is no offence and that they will attend the interroga-



tion if they receive notices from the ED. Speaking to the media Anjan Kumar Yadav said they had helped the Congress newspaper 'National Herald' when it was in trouble.

"I was elected as an MP twice. I was born and brought up in Hyderabad but I have no land in Hyderabad. I am not afraid of the ED. Politicians who entered politics a few years ago have constructed houses on acres of land here. I

demand that the ED should probe them if it has guts. The BJP has started to tremble after Rahul Gandhi launched his Bharat Jodo Yatra. The BJP is also afraid of the Munugode by-poll and so it has started blackmail," he said.

"I hatched a conspiracy to kill Sukhbir, along with gangster Papla and other associates and finally gunned down him," he added. Mukhtar Ansari gets five-year jail in Gangster Act case

The Lucknow Bench of the Allahabad High Court on Friday sentenced former MLA Mukhtar Ansari to five-year imprisonment in a 23-year-old case related to the Gangster Act. Justice D K Singh passed the order overturning the acquittal by a special MP-MLA court in 2020. The court also imposed a fine of Rs 50,000 on Ansari. State counsel Rao Narendra Singh said the FIR was lodged with the Lucknow's Hazratganj police in 1999 and a special court had acquitted Ansari in 2020. The state had filed an appeal against acquittal in 2021. The High Court on Friday allowed the state

government's appeal and sentenced Ansari to five years in jail, he said. On Wednesday, Mukhtar Ansari was awarded seven-year jail in another case for threatening a jailer and pointing a pistol at him. In 2003, the then Lucknow district prison jailer SK Awasthi had lodged an FIR with the Alambagh police alleging that he was threatened for ordering a search of people who came to meet Ansari. A trial court had acquitted Ansari in this case also.



Mumbai man gets video call threatening bomb blast in country

he Mumbai police have registered an offence against unidentified persons after a man in suburban Santacruz allegedly received a video call threatening about a bomb I blast in the country, an official said on Friday. Rafat Hussain (55) allegedly received a video call on Tuesday from unidentified persons who claimed that they would be carrying out a bomb blast in the country, he said. Hussain then approached Santacruz

police station and informed officials about the threat call and lodged a complaint, he said. An FIR under sections 505 (statements conducing to public mischief) and 506 (2) (criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) has been registered against unidentified persons, the official said. The police were verifying the mobile number from which the man received a threat call, he said, adding that a probe is underway.



Urban Naxals had stalled Sardar Sarovar work: PM

Kerala HC takes *suo motu* case against PFI for declaring 'illegal' hartal

The Kerala High Court on Friday said the hartal called by the Popular Front of India today was prima facie contempt of court since it went against a 2019 order passed by it on such protests.

Justice A K Jayasankaran Nambiar said despite its 2019 order, a call for a flash hartal was made on Thursday by the PFI. It was an "illegal" hartal.

The court took suo motu case against PFI, the radical Islamic outfit, and its state general secretary over declaring hartal in the southern state

"The action of the aforementioned persons in calling for the hartal without following the procedure contemplated in our earlier order, prima facie, amounts to contempt of the directions of this Court in the order aforementioned,' the judge observed.

Initiating suo motu case, the court issued directions to the police to ensure adequate measures to prevent any damage or destruction to public and private property of those who do not support the call for hartal. "In particular, police shall

also take steps to monitor any such activity by the supporters of the illegal hartal and shall place before this Court a report giving details of such instances and the extent of damage, if any, caused to public/private property.



"The said details would be necessary for this Court to take remedial action to recover such losses from the perpetrators of the illegality," Justice Nambiar said.

The court also asked the police to grant adequate protection to all public utility services that apprehend violence, at the hands of those supporting the illegal hartal

PFI activists beaten up by local people in Kannur

A group of Popular Front of India (PFI) activists were beaten up by local people when they tried to forcefully down the shutters of shops here as part of the hartal called by their outfit in the state on Friday. Uphill task

If Gehlot is elected as Cong chief, he will have to strive hard to revive the party

ajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot is said to be leading the race for Congress president; and this is not because he is a party stalwart, which he is, but because he enjoys the blessings of the Gandhi family. A non-family member will head the 'grand old party' after decades since senior leader Rahul Gandhi said no family member should head the party. So, in effect, Gehlot is the family's nominee. Former Union Minister Shashi Tharoor, who was considered close to the family but later joined the rebel G-23 group, is reportedly keen to take on Gehlot. Some other leaders may also enter the fray. The Kerala MP, however, has failed to enthuse many leaders. The Congress units in 10 States, including in his home State, have reportedly opposed him. Some of Tharoor's party colleagues in Kerala have said they would support only those who recognise the Nehru family's prominence. Gehlot clearly enjoys that support but the 71-year-old Congress veteran is not very happy,



for the Congress president's post comes with conditionality: He has to leave the top office in Rajasthan. This will be a bitter bite for him as his bête noire in the State, Sachin Pilot, is likely to succeed him. There are media reports suggesting that he wanted the next Chief Minister of his choice, a demand that doesn't seem to have been acceded to. For the top Congress leadership, the intra-party election may be an opportunity to kill two birds with one stone: Get a non-family party president, thus blunting the BJP's attacks of the GOP being a family-run party; and putting an end to the Gehlot-Pilot tussle in Rajasthan.

The interim chief of the Congress, Sonia Gandhi, before her meeting with Gehlot, had an hour-long chat with Pilot. While the proposed arrangement — Gehlot as the Congress chief and Pilot as Rajasthan Chief Minister — will suit the party's top brass, it may not exactly delight Gehlot. He may head the country's oldest political party but, with Pilot as the Chief Minister, the old warhorse will have hardly any say in his own home State. The reasons are obvious: There was a lot of bad blood between Gehlot and his former Deputy Chief Minister, Pilot. The Congress will hope that Gehlot, if elected, would focus on the new job rather than bemoaning the loss of the previous one. The bigger issue would be the interference of the family in running the party. If that continues, and in the manner the interference continues, the chances of party revival will be considerably diminished. While Rahul has been consistent in his criticism and condemnation of the Narendra Modi regime, and his Bharat Jodo Yatra has also gained some traction, his and his family members' performance has been, to put it mildly, suboptimal. Some of the Gandhis' decisions have been completely bereft of rationality. Gehlot, if elected, will have a lot of baggage to deal with. Reviving the party will be an uphill task.

New-look PM CARES

The PM's fund has three new trustees, including the illustrious Ratan Tata

he Prime Minister's Citizen Assistance and Relief in Emergency Situations Fund (PM CARES) is all set to enter a new phase. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has decided to widen its board of trustees. Three new trustees were inducted in a meeting chaired by the PM himself. The Union Home Minister and the Finance Minister are already the fund's trustees. The three new members are former Supreme Court judge KT Thomas, former Deputy Speaker Kariya Munda and industrialist Ratan Tata, all of them octogenarians. The Advisory Board to PM CARES would have Rajiv Mehrishi, the former Comptroller and Auditor General of India, Sudha Murthy, former Chairperson, Infosys Foundation, and Anand Shah, co-founder of 'Teach for India' and former CEO of Indicorps and Piramal Foundation. This now gives PM CARES some semblance of a public trust rather than a government body. Modi said the participation of new



trustees and advisors will provide 'wider perspectives to the functioning of the PM CARES Fund' as their vast experience in public life would impart further vigour in making the fund more responsive to various public needs. It is true though this should have been done at the time of formation of the fund.

In fact, the fund drew flak from all guarters for being 'redundant' as the Prime Minister Relief Fund already existed for such exigencies. So what was the need to have such a fund in the first place? Besides, they objected to the fact that the Government kept it away from the CAG audit's

ambit. The Government's stand has been that it doesn't get Government funding, rather only private funds. However, that is debatable as PM CARES has allegedly received multi-million funds from PSUs, Government departments, etc which run on exchequer's money. It goes without saying that once the name of Ratan Tata is associated with PM CARES, it would give validation to its motives and ensure transparency. Besides, if the fund has to have respectability, the money must be used judiciously. Unfortunately in the past, there were reports of substandard medical equipment being bought by the PM CARES money. Every penny counts and must be spent transparently, whether the money is received from a private enterprise or a PSU. Let's hope that Ratan Tata's trusteeship brings about a radical change in the PM CARES disbursal of funds.

The sudden spurt in Afghan blasts




Will Taliban be able to defeat a resurgent Islamic State of Khorasan Province, which is carrying out terror strikes to undermine the regime?

he continuing explosions in Afghanistan the latest at the time of writing being the one that killed at least three in Kabul on September 21, 2022 - have been attributed to or claimed by the Islamic State of Khorasan Province (ISKP), an affiliate of the Daesh or Islamic State. Many also call the organisation, which made its appearance in Afghanistan in 2014 (2015, according to some), the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria-Khorasan (ISIS-K).

These blasts and other terror strikes are aimed at undermining the Taliban regime in Afghanistan. As Asfandyar Mir, a senior expert at the US Institute of Peace, points out in a Wilson Centre paper, dated October 8, 2021, "ISIS-K sees the Taliban as an irreconcilable enemy that needs to be militarily defeated." While "sustained military hostilities" have aggravated the enmity between the organisations, "the main cause remains their sectarian difference". The ISKP subscribes to the "Jihadi-Salafism ideology — and plays up the purity of its anti-idolatry credentials, the Taliban subscribe to "an alternative Sunni Islamic sectarian school, the Hanafi madhhab," which ISKP regards as "deficient". The two groups also differ ver the role of nationalism. The ISKP's fierce rejection of it "runs counter to the Afghan Taliban's aims of ruling over Afghanistan".

The blasts and other forms of terror strike have, no doubt, seriously undercut the Taliban narrative that their rule has brought security to Afghanistan. They also raise the question whether the Taliban regime itself is secure. Of course, it is one thing to trigger explosions and quite another to defenestrate the Taliban regime. It is always difficult to prevent terror strikes including bomb blasts. The initiative lies with the perpetrators and Governments can only react post-facto. Preventive action can only be taken if advance information is available as a result of deep and extensive penetration of the organisation concerned by intelligence agen-

She further cites Abdul Sayed, a security expert who tracks the ISKP and other jihadi groups, as saying that the ĬSKP carried out 119 attacks in Afghanistan in the last four months of 2021 against 39 in the corresponding peri-

od of 2020. The ISKP has also doubled its strength in Afghanistan from around 2,000 to 4,000 since the Taliban's return to power. This is both a result of escape/release of its fighters from prisons that followed, those disillusioned by Taliban and many of the former Afghan Government's military and intelligence agency (the National Directorate for Security) personnel joining it, the last two perceiving it to be the most effective opponent to the Taliban. Clearly, the Taliban have a major problem at hand. So has the world. REMOVE CODIFIED BIAS ON WAQF PROPERTIES

The Waqf Act is the outcome of politics of appeasement

he Waqf Board in Tamil Nadu has claimed ownership of an entire village. Media reports claimed that Muslim resettlement in this area happened in 1927-28 and the Wakf Board has claimed its stake on the property of village temple also. There have been many such instances where people who were dwelling the property were unaware of the fact that it has been claimed as Wakf property by the board.

The Wakf Act was initially passed by Parliament in 1954 and subsequently Wakf Act, 1995, was enacted for the purpose of better administration of Aukaf (i.e., assets donated for religious or charitable causes).

However, this law has become a tool to grab the assets and innocent people are harassed due to its draconian provisions. The Act empowers the Waqf Board to declare any property as Waqf property based on the survey carried out by its team. If this is not enough, Section 6 specifies that the aggrieved party has to appeal to the Tribunal constituted under the Act and there is a limitation period of one year for raising the dispute.



This legislation is drafted in such a way that it is not necessary for the Board to give a notice to the person whose property is sought to be declared as Waqf property and if the aggrieved party has not litigated within a period of one year, then he has no legal recourse!

Section 40 of the Act reiterates this power of Waqf Board and any property shall remain vested with it until revoked by the Tribunal. Section 83 read along with 85 gives exclusive powers to the Tribunal and parties aggrieved by the decision of the Tribunal can approach the High Court. Plight of the common man can be understood when his property is declared as Waqf asset without his knowledge and then he is expected to litigate it within a period of one year, otherwise it is gone forever. Even if he litigates it with the Tribunal then the next recourse is at High Court level, which is out of reach for most of the Indians.

It is pertinent to note that in a matter related to Wakf Act, 1954, the Supreme Court had decided that the limitation of one year for initiating the litigation is not applicable for non-Muslims (Board of Muslim Wakf, Rajasthan versus Radha Kishan and Others, 1978), but in order to appease the Muslims, section 6 was amended in 2013 and now there is a uniform time limit of one year for all the aggrieved parties.

Rajindar Sachar, chairman of the Sachhar Committee, in his 2006 report estimated the value of Wakf property at Rs 1.2 lakh crore. The Wakf Board owns around six lakh acres of land. Sachhar suggested survey of Wakf properties and amendments to the Wakf Act which were duly incorporated in the law by way of amendment in 2013.

Indian history is full of partiality against the Hindus and nothing changed even after Independence. Jawaharlal Nehru got Hindu Code Bills passed by Parliament but he didn't dare to touch the practices of other religions. Dr. BR Ambedkar was in favour of a uniform civil code, but Nehru insisted on changing the Hindu laws only and gave liberty to the others. Charitable & Endowment Acts were enacted by state governments in the 1950s to manage the Hindu temples but a central legislation was passed in 1954 to protect the Wakf properties.

The Congress government at the Centre implemented the Places of Worship Act, 1991, which intends to bar the Hindu's claims on other holy shrines.



Storytelling answer to today's business challenges

Storytelling can be the answer to many of today's business challenges, says a new book by executive coach Jyoti Guptara who provides practical tips to master this business skill.

Published by Pippa Rann Books & Media and distributed by Penguin Random House India, "Business Storytelling From Hype to Hack: Unlock the Software of the Mind" tells how stories can work for different individuals.

"Despite being a professional novelist, I did not appreciate the value of storytelling in

a United Nations partner organisation. There, I realised that some of the best content came after and between presentations, informally - when people told stories," Guptara

He then applied his experience with fiction to developing and applying strategy, to executive education, and to helping business leaders find their own best stories and tell them more effectively in talks, in pitching ideas, influencing meetings, and steering organ-

"When you have an impor-

tant message, you need to communicate it so that it 'clicks' (makes immediate sense) and 'sticks' (is memorable, repeatable, and consistently acted upon). You can hack this communications challenge with stories," the author savs.

According to him, story-telling has become a buzzword in business, especially in marketing. There is corresponding scepticism by non-believers as well as disillusionment by people who have either tried and not been satisfied with their own performance, or have tried and not been satis-

Guptara says his book is about taking people beyond the hype. "Telling stories is a brain hack. This is your hacker's guide.'

He says in business, we tell stories to get results, not to entertain. Even if the intended result is to build a genuine connection. 'Yes, stories hack the brain,

but what you're really hacking is what gets in the way of a human connection. Think of it like shedding unnecessary baggage and cutting to the chase, he writes. Stories, Guptara feels, are not merely for content

creators and marketing departments.

"Storytelling in a broader sense - giving clarity, meaning and motivation - is something that is relevant to every department in every industry, at every level. It is mission critical."He says CEOs don't need to work out all of the organisation's stories, but they do need a working understanding of how stories operate and where they need deploying. They must have the important business skill: narrative com-

This booklet, he says, is the "hack to understanding your

hack".Readers can explore the power of storytelling for seven key areas of life and business, from becoming a more interesting conversationalist to getting buy-in for an idea.

Guptara argues that storytelling is the quickest, cheapest and deepest way to more influence.

"Mastering storytelling can make you more successful, but perhaps more importantly, it will help you reconnect your life and business with your humanity and make you happier. It will help you hack yourself," he writes.

Actor Ryan Grantham sentenced to life imprisonment for killing mother

Pormer Riverdale and Diary of a Wimpy Kid actor Ryan Grantham has been sentenced to life behind bars without the possibility of parole for 14 years

for killing his mother.

The by-the-book seconddegree murder punishment was handed down by British Columbia Supreme Court Justice Kathleen Ker on September 21 in Vancouver, reports a portal.

With the sentence already a forgone conclusion over the laws of the Canadian province, the only real wild card was how long the guilty pleading Grantham would have to wait before the currently 24-year-old could apply for parole.

The Leo Awards nominat-

ed Grantham turned himself to police soon after shooting his 64-year-old mother Barbara Waite in the back of

between 10 and 25 years. In that context, prosecutors had recommended in a sentencing hearing earlier this year that Grantham receive a parole ineligibility up to 18 years. The former actor's legal team had suggested 12 years as a fair con-sequence. Clearly Justice Ker met them in the middle in her ruling this week. Originally charged with

first-degree murder, Grantham has been in custody for the past two and a half years, law enforcement officials in Vancouver confirmed to a portal.

Participating in a mental health program since his arrest, Grantham is in the process of being readied for transfer to a more permanent facility, sources say.

It later was revealed in court that after the murder of his mother. Grantham

took video of the body and confessed to the killing oncamera. A day later, after carefully arranging the body in a semi-religious scene, Grantham hit the road. With ever changing intent, he at one point was going to try to kill Canadian PM Justin Trudeau, as he also wrote in a journal entered as evidence.

Taking us through how it all started, she says, "Engineering just happened to me, because that's usually the root that a lot of people do take. I wanted to be a model since I was 16, as early as I can remember. Once I got financially dependent I think that helped me to take my own decisions. I took my first step towards my journey into modelling in 2017. That was the year that I graduated and had a job in a metro city because before that I was never in a metro city.

I never thought people would actually pay to learn from me. In June 2020 when I resigned from my job in between the pandemic, this is the only option that I had in front of me. ot winning an ODI World Cup will be her "only regret" in an otherwise distinguished two-decade career, India's fast bowling great Jhulan Goswami said on Friday as she gears up for her final international game.

Goswami will retire after the third ODI against England at the iconic Lord's on Saturday.

An emotional Goswami said she is grateful to the game for giving her name and fame but not having a World Cup trophy in her cabinet will remain an unticked box.

The Indian team had ended second-best during the 2005 and 2017 editions of 50-over World Cup.

"I have played two World Cup finals, if we had won at least one, then it would have been very nice for me and the team. Every individual works for that goal. We played 2-3 finals, but we were not able to win, that remains my only regret," the 39-year-old pacer said ahead of third and final clash.

"You prepare for a World Cup for four years. There is a lot of hardwork. For every cricketer, it is a dream-come-true moment to win a World Cup. But from where I am looking, the graph of women's cricket has only gone

"When I started I never thought of playing for such a long time. It was great experience. I am fortunate to play the

"Honestly, coming from a humble background and a small town like Chakdah (in West Bengal's Nadia district), I did not have any idea about women's cricket and how professional setup works. I am fortunate enough, thanks to my family and parents, they always supported me," she said.

Goswami said receiving the India cap was the most memorable moment of her cricketing

"My best memory is when I got the India cap from my cap-tain and bowled the first over because I never imagined (that I will play for India). The journey was difficult as I had to travel for two-and-half hours by local train one way everyday for train-



Rajamouli's RRR, starring NTR Jr and Ram Charan, has been making waves around the world since it released in March and has collected some \$150 million, making it the fourth highest grossing Indian film of all time.

The Hindi-language dubbed version of RRR, a film originally made in the Telugu-language, is the only non-English-language film to trend globally for 10 consecutive weeks on Netflix.

Another film by Rajamouli, 2017's Baahubali 2: The Conclusion is the second highest grossing film of all time in India with \$278 million. Next up for Rajamouli is an asyet-untitled film staring Mahesh Babu, which he has described as a globetrotting action-adventure. The film will commence production in the spring of 2023.

Rajamouli's credits also include Magadheera, Eega and Maryada Ramanna. RRR was recently snubbed as India's entry in the Oscars' international feature category in favor of Pan Nalin's Last

in the 1920s, the historical fiction story by Vijayendra Prasad and Rajamouli imagines reallife Indian freedom fighters Alluri Sitarama Raju (Ram Charan) and Komaram Bheem (NTR Jr) meeting and becoming fast friends. The occupying colonial British are their common enemy.

film in all categories.

supporting actor (Ajay Devgn), supporting actress (Alia Bhatt), original song (Naatu Naatu), original score (M.M. Keeravaani), cinematography, produc-tion design, film editing, costume design, makeup and hairstyling, sound and visual effects.

"Over the last six months, we have seen the joy that S.S. Rajamouli's RRR has brought to global audiences," said the president of Variance Films, Dylan Marchetti. "We have heard fans from around the world tell us that they believe this is one of the best films of the year from any nation. We agree. We proudly invite the Academy to consider RRR in all categories.
