BJP Most Preferred Choice of Voters: Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday cited poll data for Assembly elections over the decades to assert that the BJP has become people's most preferred choice for governance as its record of retaining power is better than the Congress and other parties. Speaking at the BJP Parliamentary Party meeting, he said not any leader but "team spirit" should be credited for the party's big win in the recent Assembly polls, noting that besides winning in three States, the party's strength has also grown in Telangana and Mizoram, sources said. The Prime Minister also asked party leaders to use the language preferred by the masses in their interaction with them. While giving an example, he said they should use "Modi ki guarantee" instead of "Modi ji ki guarantee".

Quoting Modi, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi told reporters that the Congress faced Assembly polls 40 times while in power in those States and could win only seven of them, having a dismal success rate of 18 per cent.

The corresponding figures for the BJP are 22 out of 39 times, a success rate of 56 per cent, Modi noted. Regional parties have fared better than the Congress but not the BJP as

they won 18 of 36 times when in power, notching up a success rate of 50 per cent. It shows that the BJP is the most preferred party for running the Government, he said. In the case of a party in power in a State for two terms facing Assembly elections, the Congress' success rate is only 14 per cent compared to the BJP's 59 per cent, he added.

The Prime Minister reiterated that the four biggest "castes" for him are the poor, youth, women and farmers, and party leaders should work for their development. He asked MPs to participate in "Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra", a Government exercise aimed at saturation coverage of various welfare schemes. Modi later wrote on X,

"Earlier today, attended the BJP Parliamentary Party meeting. Our party karyakartas are buoyed by the party's performance in the recent Assembly elections and are looking forward to working even harder in the times to come, spreading the message of development among people of all walks of life".

"We will continue to fulfil people's aspirations and empower the poorest, downtrodden and marginalised," he added. Earlier, Modi was given a standing ovation at the meeting following the party's stupendous win in three Assembly polls. Party MPs raised slogans lauding his leadership as senior leaders, including BJP president JP Nadda, felicitated Modi at the first meeting of the BJP Parliamentary Party in Parliament's Winter Session. The BJP scored a thumping win over the Congress in the Assembly polls in three States of Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan. Modi's leadership has been cited as the primary reason for its big win. Even as the Congress snatched power from the BRS in Telangana, the BJP's vote share and tally rose. The BJP Parliamentary Party, which includes all its Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha members, generally meets every week during sessions. In the meetings, its leaders, including Modi, speak on different issues relevant to the agenda in Parliament and also to its organisational and political campaigns. Modi greeted with slogans by treasury benches in the Rajya Sabha. Modi was greeted with the thumping of desks and slogans by Treasury Benches as he entered the Rajya Sabha during the Question Hour on

Thursday. He attends the Question Hour proceedings every Thursday, the day when queries related to the departments he handles are listed. This is the first time he entered the Rajya Sabha during the Winter Session of Parliament that started on December 4. Soon after the Prime Minister entered the Upper House, some members also started raising slogans like "BJP guarantee, Modi guarantee" and "Teesri baar, Modi Sarkar" as he assumed his seat next to the Leader of the House Piyush Goyal. BJP president J P Nadda was also present in the House. In a separate event during the day, the Prime Minister urged people to become 'Viksit Bharat Ambassadors', saying it is an ideal way to spread the development agenda and utilise "our energies to fulfill our mission to make India a developed nation". Modi said 140 crore Indians have shown the world what people-powered development is. "Let us join in this mass movement by signing up on NaMo App, and accepting the 100 day challenge of performing simple but highly impactful tasks in the Viksit Bharat Ambassador module," he said. Modi said he looks forward to personally meeting some of the most energetic and bright ambassadors from all walks of life.

US and Canada not on the same page for India on Khalistan: EAM

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Thursday said there was no question of "equitable treatment" of the United States and Canada in relation to the allegations that Indian officials were involved in the targeting of Khalistan separatists in the two countries, as one had provided inputs to India and the other had not. Making this assertion in the Rajya Sabha, he also informed the Rajya Sabha that India has constituted an inquiry committee to look into the inputs received from the US as these have a bearing on the country's national security. He made this assertion days after Washington alleged an Indian link to a foiled plot to kill Sikh separatist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun on its soil. Replying to a supplementary question on the US charges, the Minister said it is not directly connected to the original question which was on the foreign visits of Union Ministers. "Insofar as the US is concerned, certain inputs were given to us as part of our security cooperation with the United States. Those inputs were of concern to us because they (were) related to the nexus of organised crime, trafficking and other matters.



"Because they have a bearing on our own national security, it was decided to institute an enquiry into the matter and an inquiry committee has been constituted," he said. The Minister was also asked why there was no equitable treatment with regard to charges made by the Canadian Government. In response, he said, "Insofar as Canada is concerned, no specific evidence or inputs were provided to us. So, the question of equitable treatment to two countries, one of whom has provided input and one of whom has not, does not arise." Last month, US federal prosecutors charged Indian national Nikhil Gupta with working with an Indian Government employee in the foiled plot to kill Pannun, who holds dual citizenship of the US and Canada.



Centre promises Chennai relief

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has directed the Ministry of Home Affairs to release in advance the second instalment of the Centre's contribution to the SDRF of ₹493.60 crore to Andhra Pradesh and ₹450 crore to Tamil Nadu in view of the floods caused by cyclone Michaung, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said. Meanwhile in Chennai, following an aerial survey and a high-level meeting with Chief Minister MK Stalin at the Secretariat, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said the first instalment of ₹450 crore had been released earlier to the State. "PM Modi is distressed by loss of lives in TN due to rains, flood," he said. In a post on X, Shah said the Prime Minister has also approved the first urban flood mitigation project of ₹561.29 crore for 'Integrated Urban Flood Management activities for Chennai Basin Project' under the National Disaster Mitigation Fund (NDMF), which also includes Central assistance of ₹500 crore. The severe cyclonic storm Michaung has affected Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh. Though the extent of damage is varied, many areas of these States have been inundated, affecting standing crops, the Home Minister said. "To help the State Governments with the management of relief necessitated by the cyclonic storm, PM @narendramodi directed the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) to release in advance the Central share of the 2nd instalment of SDRF (State Disaster Response Fund) of ₹493.60 crore to Andhra Pradesh and ₹450 crore to Tamil Nadu," he said. "I pray for the safety and well-being of all those affected. We stand with them in this crucial hour and will ensure the situation normalises at the earliest," Shah said. Michaung left behind a trail of destruction in Andhra Pradesh, damaging 770-kilometre roads, uprooting trees and killing livestock. According to data shared by the Chief Minister's Office (CMO), nearly 40 lakh people from 194 villages and two towns were affected by Michaung's impact.

Telangana welcomes its new Chief Minister

Congress legislature party leader A Revanth Reddy was on Thursday sworn in as Chief Minister of Telangana which was attended by top Congress leaders, including Sonia Gandhi and Mallikarjun Kharge. Governor Tamilisai Soundararajan administered the oath of office and secrecy to Revanth Reddy and the Ministers at L B Stadium. Congratulatory messages poured for Reddy from top leaders, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, but the new CM's 'Bihari DNA' remark recently drew sharp reactions from BJP leaders who sought explanation not only from him but top Congress and its ally INDIA Bloc members. Members of Opposition parties, including Chief Ministers Mamata Banerjee, Hemant Soren, MK Stalin and others like Sharad Pawar, Sitaram Yechury were invited personally by Revanth by phone calls but none could make it due prior scheduled engagements however maximum of them had participation

in the oath ceremony by their representatives. Modi assured the new CM all possible support to further the progress of the State. "Congratulations to Revanth on taking oath as the Chief Minister of Telangana. I assure all possible support to further the progress of the state and the welfare of its citizens," Modi said. Besides Revanth, Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka (Deputy Chief Minister), N Uttam Kumar Reddy, Komatireddy Venkata Reddy, C Damodar Rajanarasimha, D Sridhar Babu, Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy, Ponnam Prabhakar, Konda Surekha, D Anasuya (popularly known as Seethakka), Tummala Nageswara Rao and Jupally Krishna Rao took oath as Ministers. Senior Congress leaders Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, Karnataka CM Siddaramaiah, his deputy D K Shivakumar, and Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu also attended the ceremony.

CM lays stone for Narsi Monjee Mgmt Institute

Saying that this institute would add another feather to the cap to higher education in the State, he hoped that the NMIMS would contribute to strengthening the educational ambience in the State and would provide support for societal causes as well.

The CM said Odisha in recent times has made significant strides in various socioeconomic parameters. It is now one of the fastest-growing economies of the country. The rising economic status of the State has created immense opportunities in attracting talents from India and across the globe. He further said India is now a leading economy of the world, the fifth largest among the nations, and set to become third in a few years. This massive economic growth of India is driven by its youth power. The NMIMS is being set up by the Shri Vile Parle Kelavani Mandal Trust. To be established in 40 acres of land given by the Odisha Government, the institute would reserve 30 per cent of seats for students of the State on merit.

Make in India eyeing one trillion

The Centre on Thursday claimed exports of manufacturing-based products have increased significantly due to the Make-in-India programme, leading to a huge growth in employment opportunities in the country. Buoyed by the 'inflection turnaround', Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnav said earlier the services sector used to dominate the export figures, but pharmaceuticals, mobile phones and merchandise have replaced it now. He attributed the increase in the export of manufactured goods to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Make-In-India programme. According to 2022-23 export data, of total exports of USD 762 billion, USD 453 billion came from manufactured goods and USD 309 billion from services, the Minister said. "This is a big turning point. It is a reflection of change in the



country's economy. Manufacturing-based exports impact a common man's life. If we study the economy of countries like Japan and South Korea, we will see that they all, during their economic journey, focussed on manufacturing while moving from low-income to middle-income and then high-income," Vaishnav, who

holds Railways, Communications and Electronics & IT portfolios, said at a Press conference. "If we study the growth period around the 1800 or early 1900 period of countries such as the US, Germany, France, UK etc, we find that they also focussed on manufacturing for moving from low income to middle

and high income. "Countries that have passed through the growth phase, all gave importance to manufacturing. This is what Modi did as the first big economic programme, economic philosophy and economics thought that he launched, Make It India, which has a big place in that," Vaishnav said. "It is the reflection of a series of programmes and simplifications that were introduced after the success of Make in India, Design in India, Innovate in India among others. According to him, manufacturing-based growth has enhanced employment opportunities which is obvious from the data of formal employment or the registration in the provident fund that has gone from 6 lakh monthly or around 70 lakh annually to up to 14 lakh to 15 lakh monthly or around 1.8 crores annually.

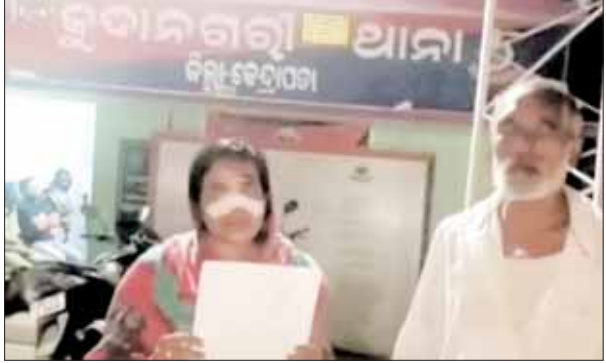

Man breaks wife's nose over trivial matter

Police registered a case under the relevant sections of the IPC and initiated an investigation.

IT raid on liquor making firms in Odisha

Rs 220-cr cash seized so far

The Income Tax (IT) Department continued to raid several liquor traders for the second day in Odisha with the seizure of cash of over Rs 200 crore so far.

IT officials conducted the raids on properties including houses and liquor manufacturing units belonging to Raj Kishore Sahoo and Debraj Sahoo simultaneously at various places in Bhubaneswar, Sundargarh, Rayagada, Boudh



and Titilagarh on the charges of evading income tax.

Sources said the officials unearthed a total cash of Rs

220 crore (bundles of Rs 500 denominations) from their

residences and country liquor shops during searches so far. The cash was sent to banks in two trucks for counting.

The simultaneous raids were still underway at 20 places in Odisha, two places in Jharkhand and two places in Kolkata.

Along with two businessmen of Sundargarh district, the raids were also carried out at office and residences of one more liquor trader namely Kameswar Tiwari in Rourkela.

Many documents were stated to have been seized by the raid team from office and houses of Tiwari at Civil Township in Rourkela.

Pradhan urges Naveen

Union Education, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has urged Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik for implementation of the Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (PM-USHA) scheme in Odisha.

In a letter, Pradhan informed Patnaik about the significance of the centrally sponsored scheme to improve higher education in the

State.

"The PM-USHA scheme is an important step of Central Government towards implementation the vision of National Education Policy, 2020 to attain higher levels of access, equity and excellence in the States/UTs higher education system by prioritising the un-served and underserved areas, to be identified by States/UTs as Focus Districts on the basis of low GER, population of SC / ST, Left-wing-affected areas, etc," Pradhan wrote.

As per the guidelines of the scheme, the States and UTs are required to sign an MoU

for on-boarding the scheme for its implementation.

He wrote that Odisha has shown active participation in the previous phases of Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) and has been successful in using the support under the scheme to improve higher education in the State.

"However, an MoU under new phase of scheme, i.e., PM-USHA, is yet to be signed by the State of Odisha," Pradhan wrote. The scheme has been approved till March 31, 2026 with a total outlay of Rs 12,926.10 crore in continuation of the RUSA scheme.

At Cuttack rly station

Fire breaks out in BBSR-Howrah Jan Shatabdi

A fire broke out in the Bhubaneswar-Howrah Jan Shatabdi Express at the Cuttack railway station on Thursday morning.

The train was en route to Howrah from Bhubaneswar. The fire erupted beneath a coach when the train halted on Platform No. 2 at the Cuttack station at around 6.35 am.

Firefighters and RPF personnel de-boarded all passengers from the train and brought the flame under control before it spread to other coaches.

After 30 minutes, the pas-

sengers were asked to go inside their coaches. The train service resumed after a technical examination by railway engineers. The East Coast Railway (ECOR) clarified that the incident occurred due to brake-binding.

"Due to brake-binding (brake not released from wheel), 12074 Bhubaneswar-Howrah Jan Shatabdi Express detained at Cuttack Railway Station from 6:30 hrs. After releasing the brake from the wheel, the train departed from Cuttack at about 7:15 hrs.

The cause of non-release of brake is being investigated," the ECOR stated.

'Cong to register Telangana-like victory in Odisha'

Though out of power in Odisha since 2000, the Congress hopes to register a Telangana-like victory in the State in the 2024 Assembly polls. On Thursday, the party's senior leaders gathered here at the Congress Bhawan and hailed the Telangana win as a "great revival".

"We are pretty confident that the Congress will present a Telangana-like performance in Odisha in 2024 and become number one player in State



politics from the present number three. We are working hard on the ground and our workers will surely fetch us a spectacular victory in the 2024 elections," Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) president Sarat Pattanayak said.

Out of power in the State since 2000 when it lost power to the then BJD-BJP coalition, the Congress now has only nine members in the 147-member Assembly. Of the 21 Lok Sabha seats, it managed to win only the Koraput seat in 2019. The party has set a target to win at least 90 Assembly seats in 2024.

The BJP which was shunted out by the ruling BJD in 2009 from an 11-year-old coalition, currently holds the second position in the Assembly with 22 members. The BJD has 113 members.

The Congress has witnessed a steady decline in its vote share. Its vote share, which

stood at 33.78% in the 2000 Assembly polls, dropped to a negligible 16.12% in 2019. In the 2022 rural polls, the Congress won only 37 of the 853 Zilla Parishad (ZP) seats while the BJD got 766 seats. The BJP was content with 42 ZP seats.

In the urban polls, the BJD won 95 out of 108 Urban Local Body Councils, BJP got 6, Congress 4.

"Our high command has given me the responsibility to lift the party from number three to number one. I am working in that direction. I as well as all the leaders and workers have taken a vow to make the party number one in the State," the OPCC chief said.

125th SLSWCA meet

19 projects of Rs 4,804.35 cr Okayed

17,553 jobs across diverse sectors promised

The State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLSWCA) gave its nod to at least 19 transformative projects worth Rs 4,804.35 crore. They promise a potential employment generation of 17,553 jobs across diverse sectors.

The 125th meeting of SLSWCA was convened here on Thursday under the guidance of Chief Secretary Pradeep Jena. The significant investments are in key sectors such as apparel and textiles, steel downstream, paint (Chemical), plastics, packaging, metal downstream,

chemicals, food, beverage and allied sectors, steel (Ferro Alloys), IT infrastructure, agro processing, renewable energy, circular economy, and infrastructure.

The projects approved are Welspun Living Limited's textile facility in Kendrapada, Tata Steel Downstream Products Limited's 10,00,000 MT Steel Service Center in Kalinga Nagar, Jajpur, Indian Metals and Ferro Alloys Limited's unit in Jajpur, Jindal Stainless Limited's stainless-steel service center unit in Jajpur, Crackers India Alloys Limited's 52,800 MT Steel Casting Mill and rolling mill with ancillary facilities in Barbil, Keonjhar,

Envirocare Infrasonolusion Private Limited's Mild Steel strips and pipes manufactur-

ing unit, Rungta Paints Private Limited's manufacturing unit for paints, allied products and Intermediate in Dhenkanal,

Modulus Oleochem and Surfactants Private Limited's comprehensive Chemical manufacturing unit in Baliapal, Baleswar, Transnova Express India Private Limited's Chemical Hub in Khordha, Berger Paints' ancillary companies, namely, Grow Max India Private Limited's manufacturing unit for plastic pails, lids, bottles and drums in Khordha and Anupam Products Limited's manufacturing unit for empty metal tin containers in Khordha, Rajshree Polypack Limited and Kesav Plastech (P) Limited's plastics manufacturing units in Khordha and Rengali Indus-

trial Area, Sambalpur, respectively.

5T chief reviews Daya river pollution

Treatment plant to be set up

5T and Nabin Odisha Chairman VK Pandian on Thursday stressed the need to keep Daya river water pollution-free and directed the State Pollution Control Board (SPCB) and the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) to take immediate steps in this direction.

Chairing a high-level meeting, Pandian observed that Daya gets polluted as the Gangua nullah, which carries the city's wastewater, flows into it.

It was decided that a treatment plant with advanced technology would be constructed

by WATCO at the confluence of Daya and Gangua to treat the water of the river.

Necessary steps would also be taken to prevent the release of industrial waste and biomedical waste to drains.

The meeting decided to make it mandatory to connect the contaminated water of various institutions in the BMC area with the sewerage line. Pandian also directed to create awareness in the direction that all the houses of BMC can be connected to the sewerage line as soon as possible.

As the capital city has different industries, regular inspections would be conducted by IDCO, SPCB and BMC to ensure proper treatment of their wastes and water.

In Balangir
Fake CBI official dupes doc of Rs 1L, held

Even as income tax raids were continuing on several liquor traders' establishments at various places in Odisha, police on Thursday arrested a man for robbing a doctor of Rs 1 lakh by posing as a CBI official in Balangir district.

While the identity of the accused was yet to be confirmed, preliminary investigation revealed that the he introduced himself as 'Smith Kumar Seth' to police.

As per reports, Seth reached the house of paediatrician Gopabandhu Sahu in Balangir Road in a white car. He introduced himself as a CBI official and said there were alle-

gations of evading income tax against the doctor. Then on the pretext of taking stringent action against Sahu, he went towards his wardrobe and seized Rs 1 lakh cash from him before leaving the place.

Later, Sahu's wife informed her brother about the incident. Suspecting foul play, they informed local police who then informed their counterparts at Saintala and arrested the accused at Naveen Chowk.

Official sources said the car of the accused was seized along with his arrest. "The accused said his name is Smita Kumar Seth, but we are confirming his identity. Investigation is underway," police said.

India needs PR system to convert votes into seats

To make our electoral system more inclusive

India needs a proportional representation (PR) system or proportionate electoral system (PES) of election in place of the current First Past The Post (FPTP) in practice to represent the mandate of all the voters in governance. The ongoing practice in India does not reflect the correct proportion between the percentage of votes and the percentage of seats captured by political parties in State Assemblies and Parliament.

The recent election results in the four States of Chhatisgarh, MP, Rajasthan and Telengana have reflected such imbalances in the percentage of votes and seats in their respective State assemblies which is not a good sign of representation in democracy. A very insignificant difference in vote share and visible difference in seats won by the parties is a matter of concern in representa-

tion.

The Rajasthan State result shows a mere difference of 2 percent of votes between Congress and BJP but BJP has got 46 more seats than Congress. The BJP has 41.7 percent of votes with 115 seats and Congress has 39.5 percent of votes with 69 seats. Among others, the BSP got 1.8 percent, RLP got 2.3 percent and BTP got 2.25 percent.

In the case of Chhatisgarh, with a 4 percent of vote difference, BJP got 19 seats more than Congress. The BJP with 46.3 percent of the vote share got 54 seats and Congress with

42.3 percent of the vote share got 35 seats. Similarly, in the case of Telengana with only 2 percent of the votes, Congress got 15 more seats than the BRS. Among others, BJP got 13.8 percent and AIMIM got 2.1 percent.

MP has also had similar results, as the BJP got 48.8 percent of the votes and 163 seats and Congress got 42.19 percent of the votes with only 66 seats, which is less than half of the seats gained by the BJP. Among others, BSP got 3.2 percent of the votes.

The question is why all votes are not being converted into seats and the winners were not represented by 51 percent of voters? The winners are not really enjoying the popular mandate in terms of vote share; rather with less votes they got elected in majority of seats to govern.

In a multi-party system with a highly polarised division of votes, the votes of different political parties must be converted into seats. As a result, even political parties with a sizeable vote percentage are

underrepresented in Assemblies and Parliaments. The national parties are also have disproportionate representation in Lok Sabha. Their votes have not been converted into seats.

The electoral system for India was debated in the Constituent Assembly of Independent India and both Jawaharlar Nehru and Dr Amedekar were in favour of PR but the proposal was withheld on the grounds of low literacy rate among voters and national unification as a major concern those days.

It was perceived that PR may encourage smaller parties and bring threat to stability of Government and national interest and unity. The FPTP system is mostly followed by former British colonies and best suit to bi-party system. The countries including, India, Canada, USA and UK have adopted FPTP system. The countries moving to multi-party system are seriously looking for more representative character of their electoral systems for inclusive governance.

The issues of representation are

vital to democracy and world wide many varieties of PR system have been well accepted in about 90 democratic countries. Many are trying to shift from FPTP to PR for better representation and to avoid waste of votes. It is found that countries with PR have better women participation as well as good human development index. Because representation has a link with development that facilitates participation and decision-making process.

There has been a demand by political parties in India, especially the Left parties and other regional parties such as DMK, to shift to PR system but national parties such as Congress and BJP have not paid much attention to the demand. The appropriate bodies such as the Law Commission and the Election Commission of India have also recommended for PR system. The neighbouring countries such as Nepal and Sri Lanka have adopted PR system to give representation to more parties and socio-ethnic groups who are politically

marginalised as minorities. Nepal has PR system with reservation to ensure better representation of the socially marginalised sections. The country has changed from monarchy as a theocratic country and from FPTP system to a secular country with parallel system without threshold in the Parliament election.

The debate of representation took place in the first Round Table Conference in 1931 in London followed by communal award but not much into the system of elections. Post independence, India enacted the Representation of People's Act 1951, and started with universal adult franchise, multi-member constituency and reserve seats for SCs and STs but women and religious minorities were not included in the system. It led to insignificant representation of women, minorities and others in the Parliament and State Assemblies. The constituency based elections in a huge socio-religious diverse society mostly reflect the mandate of the

polarised communal majorities as political majority and the representatives of smaller parties, ethnic and religious minorities are not getting adequately represented in the present system though they have support of the a sizeable voters because their votes are not converted into seats. The minority leaders in the Constituent Assembly such as Kaji Sayedi Karimudin raised these issues.

In modern democratic governance, political representation of citizens is vital to the public policy making process. Every citizen / voter must have the right to be represented in legislative bodies that frame policies for their citizens' development, distribution of power and resources. But India being the largest democracy has not yet giving representation to a major section of political parties contesting elections. In order to widen our democracy we need to change our electoral system to make it more inclusive of a major section of voters.

Mule bank A/C scam: STF nabs another accused from WB

The Special Task Force (STF) of Odisha police has arrested one more accused involved in the mule bank account racket taking the total arrests to four. The accused was identified as Samim Islam of Gudhia village under Murshidabad district in West Bengal.

Islam was arrested on December 4 and was produced before the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Lalbag, Murshidabad. Later, he was brought to Bhubaneswar on a

three-day transit remand.

He was produced before the court of SDJM, Bhubaneswar. Islam was one of the key members of the racket with links mainly in West Bengal and Bihar.

Earlier, the STF had arrested three persons for their alleged involvement in running an inter-State racket of mule bank accounts.

The accused were identified as Sheikh Hapizul, Sheikh Jahangir of Olamara in Baleswar district and Sheikh Jamaluddin of Rampura of West Medinapur in West Ben-

gal. The accused were running mule bank accounts and sold these bank accounts along with the connected mobile numbers to various cyber, cyber-financial, sextortion scammers and other criminals based in Kolkata and other parts of the country.

This racket operated mainly in the tri-junction area of Odisha, Jharkhand, and West Bengal, especially in the districts of Baleswar, Mayurbhanj, East Midnapore, West Midnapore, East Sighbhoom, West Singhbhoom, and Saraikela, said the STF.

This racket was headed by Sk

Jamiruddin of West Midnapore. He had employed around 10 to 15 people at a salary of 15,000 per month to open bank accounts.

These members visited various interior areas of these districts targeting mainly poor villagers ORtribal and luring them into opening bank accounts. Villagers were generally paid Rs 2,000 per account for giving their documents and opening bank accounts.

However, the mobile numbers linked with bank accounts were provided by gang members.

Rejection of claims for Rs 31,47,73,646

Birla Tyres workers' body moves NCLAT

Against NCLT's decision

In a legal twist, the Birla Tyres Workers' Union has lodged an appeal with the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) in New Delhi contesting a recent approval of the Resolution Plan by the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT), Kolkata Bench.

Advocate Akash Sharma is representing the union in what promises to be a high-stakes battle over alleged discrepancies in claim handling and workers' rights.

The union, representing 307 workers, originally filed claims totaling Rs 31,47,73,646. However, the Resolution Plan (RP) approved

a mere Rs 2,67,44,055, which is 8.48 percent of the total claim. Of particular concern is the arbitrary rejection of claims from 191 contractual workers, despite a directive from the Industrial Tribunal.

The appeal raises questions about the RP's adherence to the Contract Labour Recognition and Abolition Act, which mandates the principal employer's responsibility for contractual workmen's claims. There are also concerns about the logic behind payments to workers, with some receiving as little as Rs 3, Rs 36, and Rs 60, seemingly without justification.

Additionally, the RP's acknowledgment of non-payment of remuneration to workers for almost two years, as indicated in a letter to the Superintendent of Police, contradicts the initial admission

‘Indian ambassador met former Navymen on death row in Qatar’

The Indian ambassador to Qatar on December 3 met eight former Indian Navy personnel who were handed death sentence by a Qatari court in October, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Thursday. Giving this update here, MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said two hearings on the appeal against the death sentence have already taken place. “We are closely following the matter and extending all legal and consular assistance...Our ambassador got consular access to meet all eight of them in prison on December 3,” Bagchi said at a media briefing.



The Indian nationals were given consular access earlier as well. The Navy veterans were on October 26 given death sentence by Qatar's Court of First Instance. India described the ruling as “deeply” shocking and vowed to explore all legal options in the case. The Indian nationals, who

worked with private company Al Dahra, were arrested in August last year reportedly in an alleged case of espionage. Neither the Qatari authorities nor New Delhi made the charges against the Indian nationals public. In its reaction to the ruling by the Qatari court, the MEA last month said that it is attaching

“high importance” to this case and is exploring all legal options. The charges were filed against the eight Indian Navy veterans on March 25 and they were tried under Qatari law. All of the former navy officers had “unblemished stints” of up to 20 years in the Indian Navy and had held important positions including that of instructors in the force, former military officials had said. In May, Al-Dhara Global closed its operations in Doha and all those working there (primarily Indians) have since returned home. In the past, the Navy had taken up the case of the former naval personnel with top brass of the government for securing their release.

Modi to inaugurate first Indian Art, Architecture and Design Biennale

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday will inaugurate the first Indian Art, Architecture and Design Biennale at Red Fort here. During the programme, he will also inaugurate the ‘Aatmanirbhar Bharat Centre for Design’ and the student biennale ‘Samunnati’, the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) said on Thursday. The Indian Art, Architecture and Design Biennale (IAADB) will serve as an introduction to the Cultural Space at Delhi, it said. In the statement, the PMO said it has been Modi's vision to develop and institutionalise a flagship global cultural initiative in the country like



the international biennales at Venice, Sao Paulo, Singapore, Sydney and Sharjah, among others. In line with this vision, a nationwide campaign to reinvent, rebrand, renovate and re-house museums was launched. Further, the development of cultural spaces in five cities - Kolkata, Delhi, Mumbai,

Ahmedabad and Varanasi -- has also been announced. The IAADB is being organised between December 9 and 15 and follows key initiatives like the International Museum Expo held in May and the Festival of Libraries in August. The biennale has been designed to initiate a holistic conversation between artists, architects, designers, photographers, collectors, art professionals and the public to strengthen the cultural dialogue, the PMO statement added. It will also provide avenues and opportunities to expand and collaborate with the creators of art, architecture and design as part of the evolving economy. Each day of the week, IAADB will hold different theme-

based exhibitions such as ‘Rite of Passage: Doors of India’, ‘Bagh e bahar: Gardens as Universe: Gardens of India’, ‘Sampravah: Confluence of Communities: Baolis of India’, ‘Shapatya: Anti-fragile algorithm: Temples of India’, ‘Vismaya: Creative Crossover: Architectural Wonders of Independent India’ and ‘Deshaj Bharat Design: Indigenous Designs’, among others. The student biennale at Lalit Kala Akademi will provide an opportunity for students to showcase their work, interact with peers and professionals, and gain valuable exposure within the architecture community through design competitions, display of heritage, installation designs and workshops, the statement said.

BJP Lok Sabha MP Ramesh Bidhuri on Thursday expressed regret for his objectionable remarks against BSP's Danish Ali in a meeting of the Lok Sabha Privileges Committee, which heard both leaders separately. Sources said Bidhuri in his deposition before the committee noted that senior BJP leader and Union minister Rajnath Singh had conveyed his regret in the House for his comments on September 21 when he was making a speech during a discussion on the success of the Chandrayaan-3 mission. Bidhuri used some objectionable comments to target Ali, who was accused by several BJP leaders of using derogatory words for Prime Minister Narendra Modi to provoke the South Delhi MP. As a row erupted in the House,



Singh rose to convey his regrets. “I express regret if the opposition is hurt by the remarks made by the member,” the Deputy Leader of the House in Lok Sabha said. With Bidhuri expressing regret, sources said, the committee was likely to bring closure to the matter and send its report to the Speaker. BJP president J P Nadda had also issued a show-cause notice to Bidhuri, known for his fiery comments which have at times sparked controversies.

With Ali and several other opposition members writing to Speaker Om Birla for taking action against Bidhuri, and quite a few BJP members accusing the BSP MP of making a running commentary during his speech and using derogatory words against the prime minister, the Chair sent complaints of both sides to the Privileges Committee. Ali also appeared before the committee and spoke in detail about the incident, sources said.

Erosion of coastal line, medical cabin in trains among issues discussed in Rajya Sabha

Erosion of country's coastal line, glorifying violence in films and its impact on youth and an appeal to have a medical cabin in trains were some of the issues which figured in the Rajya Sabha on Thursday. Raising the issue of erosion of coastal line, Jose K Mani asked the government to undertake a comprehensive scientific study and formulate a coastal protection plan. During Zero Hour mention, the Kerala Congress (M) MP raised concerns over coastal erosion along shores of Kerala, saying “It is a matter of grave concern that requires immediate attention.” Coastal erosion poses a threat not only to the environment but also to the livelihood of coastal communities, he added. India has a 7,560 km long coastline of which Kerala has a 590 km stretch. “According to the study by the National Centre for Coastal Research, 33.6 per cent of the Indian coastal line is vulnerable to erosion and nearly 46 per cent of Kerala coastline is already affected,” he said. These statistics, he added should not be viewed as a mere number, but warning of the impending crisis in the state and nation, Mani added. He further said the coastal erosion is due to various factors such as climate change, unregulated human activities, inadequate Coastal Zone Management, mining and



tourism. Prashant Nanda (BJD) cited the death of a 38-year-old man on board a Rajdhani train due to medical reasons and suggested that long haul trains should have a coach with ICU, ventilator and oxygen facilities. R a n j e e t Ranjan (Congress)speoke about the bad influence of movies and songs depicting violence and negative roles portrayed by heroes. Vivek K Tankha raised the issue of shortage of emergency beds in AIIMS and demanded that they should be increased. Kanimozhi NVN Somu(DMK)expressed concern over the menace of spam calls despite regulation by the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI). “There is a pressing need to have a preventive framework other than just filing complaints through the TRAI,” she said. She demanded that the telecom department take immediate action to curb unsolicited calls and SMS in spite of TRAI regulations, or DND (do not disturb) registration.

‘States except Punjab made significant progress in stopping stubble burning’

As the national Capital Region grapples with poor air quality index, Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav on Thursday told Rajya Sabha that Haryana and other states have made significant progress in stopping cases of stubble burning in farms but Punjab has not. Replying to supplementaries during Question Hour in Rajya Sabha, he said, “It is unfortunate the maximum incidents of stubble burning have taken place in Sangrur district in Punjab, which is the home district of chief minister Bhagwant Mann.” Yadav said the Centre has provided special grants to state governments to stop farmers from not burning stubble in their fields and the Centre has provided machines and other measures. “I can say that the progress seen in stopping stubble burning in Haryana and other states, the same progress has not been made in Punjab. I would say that if the measures provided by the Centre were put to use, then Punjab would have also seen the same progress in stopping stubble burning as seen in other states,” he told the members. Yadav said the Centre has released a fund of Rs 2,440 crore for stopping such stubble burning in Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh. He also informed the house that the Centre has earmarked a sum of Rs 19,711 crore for tackling air pollution problem in the country.

To a question on whether the Centre would review the air pollution law of 1981 and the National Ambient Air Quality Standards in 2009 in light of the growing evidence about the impact of air pollution, Yadav said the Centre has identified 131 cities across the country for reducing pollution and standards have been set there. There has been a satisfactory improvement in air pollution in these cities, he said. “Some municipal corporations in these cities which have done good work have also been awarded in this regard,” the minister said. In response to another question on considering making it mandatory to supply glass or recyclable bottles, he said the Centre has banned single-use plastic across the country and has requested State authorities to also aid in implementing this. Replying to another query, he said the government is awaiting a report from the newly constituted panel tasked to finalise the draft notification to officially earmark the eco-sensitive areas (ESA) in Western Ghats. The environment ministry, based on the Kasturirangan committee report, had in 2014 published a draft notification identifying the ESAs and suggested measures for its protection. Due to objections from several states, a new panel was set up 12 years after the Madhav Gadgil committee, and a decade after the K Kasturirangan Committee submitted their respective reports. The new panel was to submit

the report last year but has sought more time. Responding to several queries on this issue during the Question Hour in the Upper House, Yadav said, “One more committee headed by former Director General of Forest Sanjay Kumar was formed to address the ground-level problems faced after the issuance of the (earlier) draft notification. I believe the committee is working in a satisfactory way.” “We are waiting for the committee's report on their assessment of the ground situation,” he added. The minister said conserving the Western Ghats is important for the country's ecology. It is spread across 16,000 sq km across six states -- Gujarat, Goa, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Kerala. It has more than 4,000 plant varieties comprising 27 per cent of the country's total plant varieties. He said the 2014 draft notification was issued after the Gadgil and Kasturirangan reports. However, a new panel was set up after concerns and several representations from MPs, including from Kerala. Land use, mining, water resources and other human activities have led to soil erosion in the Western Ghats. However, the government is implementing several measures, including afforestation, to protect the ESAs, Yadav said. The environment minister added that at the recent COP28 meet, India initiated the ‘Green Fund’ at the global level and listed out areas where it can start green initiatives.

CDS Chauhan calls for domestic defence industries to bolster tech capabilities

Chief of Defence Staff General (CDS) Anil Chauhan on Thursday called upon the domestic defence industries to bolster technological capabilities to address traditional and future challenges. Inaugurating the Avionics Exposition 2023 organised by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL)here, he urged the industry to understand the requirement of services, and evolve solutions that fit country's terrain, climate and operational requirements. “India's challenges must be resolved with Indian solutions as a series of contemporary events have exposed the vulnerability of global supply chains,” he said. The CDS pointed out that the government has adopted the ‘Aatmanirbharta’ approach to mitigate uncertainties and this vision demonstrates its confidence in the domestic industry. “A number of steps are being taken to strengthen the defence industrial capabilities under the ‘Aatmanirbharta’ initiative. We are boosting our indigenous and innovative defence capabilities,” he said. Highlighting the economic

prospects of self-reliance in defence including aerospace and avionics, General Chauhan asserted that the defence industrial sector has a large potential to achieve the country's economic goals. “Global Military Avionics Market is projected to grow US\$ 56.998 billion by 2030. This provides us a window of opportunity which needs to be exploited by believing in the mantra of ‘Make for India, Make for World’” he said. The CDS underscored the significance of new-age technologies and termed it essential for modern militaries to be ready to fight today while preparing for an “uncertain and ambiguous” future, in the era of dynamic global security landscape and rapid technological advancements. Stating that the convergence of new technologies is making the battle space more automated and autonomous, he stressed that the advent of technological solutions in the field of networking, data analytics and robotics have heralded a new landscape in the field of avionics. General Chauhan urged the military and the scientific community to maintain pace with the technological requirements, so that the nation remains ahead of the curve.

IAF airdrops indigenous heavy platform

The Aerial Delivery Research and Establishment (ADRDE) is a premier defence research laboratory.

‘Government in process of filling up 112 vacant HC judge posts’

Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal on Thursday told the Rajya Sabha that the government is in the process of filling up 112 vacant posts of High Court judges. Appointment of judges in higher judiciary is a collaborative and integrated process involving the executive and the judiciary. It requires consultation and approval from various constitutional authorities, he said during the Question Hour in the Upper House. Meghwal said the total sanctioned strength of high court



judges is 1,114 out of which 790 posts are filled while 234 are vacant, he said. Different High Court Collegiums have recommended 292 names out of which, 110 have been appointed while 112 are in the process, the law

minister added. He told the House that the sanctioned strength of judges in the Supreme Court is 34 and all of them are filled up as of now. Meghwal also mentioned that the Narendra Modi government raised the sanctioned strength of judges for both the High Courts and the Supreme Court. During the UPA regime, the sanctioned strength of High Court judges was 906 and the Supreme Court judges were 31, he said in response to queries from Congress and DMK leaders on delay in clearing the names of advocates for the post of High Court judges.

Situation remains grim in parts of Chennai, suburbs

Parts of the city and its suburbs in adjoining districts remained water-logged on Thursday, days after Cyclone Michuung brought torrential downpour, paralysing life in the metropolis and its surrounding areas. Chennai, Tiruvallur, Kancheepuram and Chengalpet bore the brunt of cyclone Michuung, which crossed the coast in Andhra Pradesh on Tuesday, before it brought heavy rains to the said four districts on December 4. The government said relief activities have been expedited and that efforts to pump out stagnant water were on in different places in the city. Velachery and parts of west Tambaram suffered from waterlogging today as well, even as food packets were air-dropped in the Pallikaralai area here. Manali in north Chennai was among the severely affected areas. Officials said drinking water, 12,000 litres of milk, milk powder, bed-

sheets and food for about 15,000 people in Manali have been dispatched. Residents complained of inflated milk prices in many localities. Chief Minister M K Stalin visited Anakaputhur locality near the city and reviewed the relief work underway. He also distributed food to the affected people. The opposition hit out at the ruling DMK over the pace of relief work. AIADMK general secretary and Leader of Opposition, Edappadi K Palaniswami claimed that of the 35,000 key interior roads under the city corporation, 20,000 were still inundated. In a statement, he questioned the government's assertion of implementing a Rs 4,000 crore storm water drain project in the city and demanded that CM Stalin release a white paper on the matter. PMK leader and former Union Minister Dr Anbumani Ramadoss said normalcy was yet to return in many parts of the affected districts and urged the government to speed up the work.

Cyclone flattens crops in AP, leaves farmers in despair

On December 5, Cyclone 'Michuung' hit the coast of Andhra Pradesh with destructive winds and heavy rains, flattening thousands of acres of standing crops, inflicting huge losses on farmers in the state. While the state government has assured compensation, the tenant farmers, a severely affected lot are not hopeful of relief as they believe it may not reach them. They said the landowners may not share the relief sums with them. According to

information shared by the Nellore district administration, agricultural crops in more than 8,400 acres and horticultural crops in 1,700 acres were damaged. In Krishna district, paddy crops in 17,000 hectares, groundnut in 903 hectares, black gram in 2,275 hectares and cotton in 213 hectares, among others were destroyed. A statewide estimate of the crop loss is yet to emerge as a note from the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said agriculture and horticulture damage will be assessed after rainwater recedes.

2015 attack on BSF convoy NIA attaches properties of 2 LeT terrorists

The National Investigation Agency on Thursday attached the properties of two key Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) operatives for their involvement in the 2015 terror attack on a BSF convoy in Udhampur district of Jammu and Kashmir. Two BSF personnel were killed and 13 others injured in the attack, which took place on August 5, 2015 on the Srinagar-Jammu national highway in Narsoo village of Udhampur district. One terrorist was killed and another, identified as Naveed, was arrested in the retaliatory action by the security forces. "The two accused whose properties have been attached today were also subsequently arrested and are currently undergoing trial in the NIA special court, Jammu," the anti-terror probe agency said. As per the NIA investigations, the duo -- identified as Fayaz Ahmed Ito alias Fayaz Khar and Khurshed Ahmed Bhat alias Surya -- are members of the banned Pakistan-backed terror organisation LeT, the agency said. All the prime accused in the case (RC-08/2015/NIA/DLI) have been charge-sheeted and are



under trial under various provisions of Ranbir Penal Code, Arms Act, Explosive Substances Act 1946, Passport (Entry into India) Act 1920 and Unlawful Activities Prevention Act 1967. In the instant case, four immovable properties, that include a single storey residential house belonging to Fayaz Ahmed Ito, in village Khudwani, Tehsil Qaimoh in district Kulgam and a two-storey residential house, along with two plots of land, belonging to Khurshed Ahmed Bhat @ Surya in village Chursoo and Sail, Awantipora, district Pulwama, have been attached under Section 33 (1) of UAPA, 1967, in pursuance of the recent orders of NIA Special Court, Jammu.

Soldiers dedication in protecting nation is unparalleled, says Modi

Nizamabad PFI criminal conspiracy case

NIA chargesheets 17th accused

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has charge-sheeted a man in connection with a criminal conspiracy by the banned Popular Front of India (PFI) in Nizamabad in Telangana to recruit, radicalise and train youths to carry out acts of terror and violence, an official said on Thursday. Nossam Mohamad Yunus is the 17th accused charge-sheeted under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code and the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act by the NIA in the case. The charge sheet was filed in a special NIA court in Hyderabad, the official said. A spokesperson of the agency said Yunus is a trained PFI cadre who was engaged in motivating and radicalising impressionable Muslim youths with the aim to carry out violent terrorist activities in furtherance of the PFI conspiracy to establish an Islamic Rule in India by 2047. "NIA has found that the accused was involved in recruiting vulnerable youth and imparting weapons training to them in PFI weapons training camps, specifically organised for

that purpose in a clandestine manner. "He was training them in the use of lethal weapons to kill their 'targets' by attacking their vital body parts such as throat, stomach and head. Further, he was also found actively promoting enmity between different religious groups in the country," the spokesperson said. The case was initially registered by the VI Town police in Nizamabad district of Telangana in July last year. The NIA took over the investigation from the Telangana Police a month later and filed its first charge sheet against 11 accused in December last year and second charge sheet against five accused in March. The NIA has been probing the anti-India activities of PFI and its many affiliates, which were declared as an "unlawful association" by the Ministry of Home Affairs in September last year, the spokesperson said. The official said the ban on the PFI and its associates came after investigations conducted by various state police units and national agencies exposed their role and involvement in violent activities in many parts of the country.



Maharashtra Government not keen to face questions: Patole

Maharashtra Congress chief Nana Patole on Thursday alleged that the government was not keen to face questions concerning farmers after an adjournment motion by his party colleague and leader of opposition in assembly Vijay Wadettiwar was rejected. An adjournment motion is moved to discuss a "definite matter of urgent public importance". Speaking to journalists at Vidhan Bhavan here after the adjournment of the House on the first day of the Winter Session, Patole said that had the government been serious about issues tied to farmers, then it would have allowed the adjournment motion moved by Wadettiwar. Farmers had high hopes from the session's first day, he said. The Congress leader said that the Eknath Shinde government is ready to discuss issues related to Vidarbha but has no time to look into matters about farmers in the region. Accusing the government of arriving in Nagpur for "tourism," he said this session will have only 5 days in a "real sense". The Winter Session, which started on Thursday, is scheduled to end on December 20. Patole said the government should spell out clearly whether it wants to help the farmers or just make announcements. Earlier in the day, the Opposition protested at the Vidhan Bhavan demanding farm loan waiver, bonus on paddy crop and higher minimum support prices (MSP) for cotton and soybean. It said farmers have been badly hit by unseasonal rains and hailstorms. Deputy Chief Minister and senior BJP leader Devendra Fadnis on Wednesday had slammed the Opposition for skipping the customary tea party ahead of the session saying it did not raise any issue related to the Vidarbha and Marathwada regions.

FBI director Christopher to visit India next week

FBI Director Christopher Wray will visit India next week against the backdrop of Washington's allegations about an Indian link to a foiled plot to kill a Sikh separatist on American soil. US ambassador to India Eric Garcetti referred to Wray's upcoming visit at an event on Wednesday while talking about the strength of US-India relationship and frequency of visits to New Delhi by top Biden administration officials. "This was the Number 1 country she (US Secretary of Treasury Janet Yellen) went to outside of the United States - four times this year. The Secretary of State (Antony Blinken) just came here for the third time. Secretary of Defense (Lloyd Austin) for the second time. The FBI director is here next week," he said. It is expected that Wray will



hold talks with senior Indian security officials. The Washington Post last week reported that the Biden administration was so concerned after discovering the plot to kill Sikh separatist Gurbhag Singh Pannun that it sent CIA Director

William J Burns and Director of National Intelligence Avril Haines to India in August and October respectively to demand investigation and hold those responsible to account. US Principal Deputy NSA Jonathan Finer visited India this week during which

he held talks with External Affairs Minister Jaishankar, NSA Ajit Doval, Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra and Deputy NSA Vikran Misri. Following the visit, the White House said Finer conveyed to New Delhi the importance of holding accountable anyone found responsible in the probe announced by India to investigate the alleged Indian link to the "lethal plotting". Last week, India described as a "matter of concern" the US linking an Indian official to a man charged with conspiring to kill Pannun. It said follow up action will be taken based on findings of an inquiry panel investigating the allegations. India has already constituted a probe team to investigate the allegations. The US federal prosecutors charged Nikhil Gupta, 52, of working with an Indian government employee in the conspiracy to kill Pannun.

Welcoming the Manipur government's move to lift the ban on liquor in the State, the Confederation of Indian Alcoholic Beverage Companies (CIABC), the apex body of Indian alcoholic beverages industry, has now urged the Bihar Government to end prohibition in the state to boost its economy, end unlawful trade of poor quality alcohol in state, and avert hooch tragedies. CIABC has been urging Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar to end prohibition in a manner that the government is able to get revenues for the state's development without compromising on the desired social goals. "By ending over three-decade long prohibition, the Manipur government has taken a positive step forward which would not only earn Rs 600-700

crore as annual tax revenues, but also help tackle the menace of sale of illegal liquor and spread of drugs. It is going to give a major fillip to the state's economic growth," said CIABC Director General, Vinod Giri. CIABC said that the Bihar Government should also follow suit and lift prohibition which has crippled the growth and development of Bihar and led to so many deaths due to hooch tragedies. "Bihar is paying a heavy price of the prohibition policy in the form of proliferation of unlawful and spurious liquor, hooch tragedies, rise of crime syndicates and loss of legitimate Government revenues. Bihar's growth and development has been affected as the state is losing out on revenue from the legitimate liquor trade which is estimated at around Rs. 10,000 crore per annum. Repeated hooch tragedies have so far seen

over 300 deaths since 2016, close to 5 lakh cases are pending in courts clogging justice delivery system, and around 3 lakh people have been put behind bars for something which the rest of the country finds perfectly lawful. Liquor mafia has been thriving in the state. Keeping all these aspects in mind, we have been urging the Bihar government to end prohibition and open up liquor trade in the state in a responsible manner," said Giri in a statement. The CIABC DG also noted that prohibition has led to creation of liquor mafia, besides causing major damage to the state's economy and potential investments, thus hitting job creation. Revenue from liquor sales used to be a major source of revenue for the state exchequer. Bihar is missing out on an annual revenue of around Rs.10,000 crore, forcing the state towards debt crisis."

Kerala Governor not discharging his duties: Vijayan

The ongoing war of words between the Left government and the Kerala Governor heated up further with Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan on Thursday alleging that Arif Mohammed Khan was not discharging his duties. Vijayan, while responding to reporters' queries about some statements made by Khan a day ago, said he has no problem if the Governor was a

"Sangh Parivar follower". "But the Governor has to function as a Governor. He is presently not discharging the duties of a Governor," the chief minister alleged. Khan on Wednesday had said that he was open to advice from the state government, "but not pressure from them." He was referring to the appointments of Vice Chancellors (VCs) to various universities in the state. The Governor had also said

the state government should come to Raj Bhavan and give him an explanation if they wanted urgent action regarding any bill or ordinance. He also asked Vijayan to ensure that the Marxist party's members and supporters avoid calling Pakistan Occupied Kashmir as 'Azad Kashmir' and not "stoke the fires of separatism and regionalism." Khan made these comments in response to media reports



about him not signing two ordinances sent for his approval by the government. On the ordinance issue, the chief minister said that if the Governor had anything to say to him, he should say it directly and not through the media. Ever since the recent Supreme Court verdict quashing the reappointment of Gopinath Ravindran as VC of Kannur University and berating the Left government for its

"unwarranted intervention" in the matter, there has been a war of words between Khan and the Left government. The apex court had found fault with Khan's order reappointing Ravindran to the post, saying the Governor had earlier "abdicated or surrendered" the statutory powers for reappointing the VC. It had also said it is the Chancellor who is conferred with competence under law to appoint or reappoint VCs.

"No other person, even the pro-chancellor or any superior authority can interfere with the functioning of the statutory authority," it had held. Following the verdict, Khan had said that state Higher Education Minister R Bindu was not to be blamed as the chief minister had used her for seeking the reappointment of Ravindran. He had accused the chief minister of having exerted pressure on him in the matter.

SHAPING UP INDIA'S 'TECHADE'


Technology is at the heart of future geo-political arrangements

Much of the discourse in Delhi this week was focused on the use of technology and its impact on society. This happened at a time when most of India was discussing the impact of the crucial state election results on the upcoming national elections next year. The conspiracy narrative that finally emerged after the last votes had been counted was that somehow, the winning team managed to technologically hack the electronic voting machines, at a mass level, which resulted in an outcome that wasn't expected! The techno-political challenges apart, there were many parallel conversations that pointed to the centrality of technology in modern geopolitical equations.

External affairs minister was addressing a global technology summit that discussed in detail the role technology, is likely to play in the wake of expected higher decibels on the political front (with the two largest democracies India and the US getting in the election mode next year and the overall impact on future of the planet. External affairs minister S Jaishankar said "We all intuitively know that the march of technology is really the history of human progress and actually pretty much every era has its particular sets of technological advancements which have defined it. We also know that the history of the world, the balances of power, the making and unmaking of nations, of civilizations are all in one way or another a reflection of how technology has grown. Now, in terms of the policy challenges that it presents, one of course is the need to regulate technology because many technologies also come with downsides and we have seen that expressed in world affairs through regimes and treaties and rules."



In one of the most candid admissions, the minister highlighted the pitfalls of India following an ideological (to be read as non-aligned) blinder-induced foreign policy approach for nearly three decades. The obvious reference was to the opt-out from the US block on nuclear technology cooperation back in the 1960s when the then US president had offered India to build a nuclear weapon of its own. India had refused on ideological high grounds and the prevailing foreign policy mindset. Some of these drained onto the national psyche, where India beyond a point, was content with importing most finished goods while sticking to being a monsoon-dependent agrarian economy. Keeping to the context Mr Jaishankar said "Where India is concerned, I think today we are, in many areas, very clearly playing catch-up. We're playing catch-up because while our era of reform started three decades ago, the era of reform was not necessarily the era of technology, and we conceptualised reform in much narrower terms. If I were today to sum up the last decade because I think we are now very clearly at the tail end of what is the second term of the Modi government, perhaps one major difference has been the centrality of technology in approaching public policy and to approach governance and towards national security. So, if one looks today at the domestic direction, the push on manufacturing, and this itself is a debate in this country, there are people who believe that it is not our competence, I would say even our karma, to do manufacturing, and that we would be wasting our time, energy and resources embarking on that path. But here's a common-sense proposition. You're not going to be able to do R&D if you don't have competitive manufacturing. You can't encourage people to be at the cutting edge if you are not at the middle level of the same business." This focus on technology at the heart of future geo-political arrangements is one dominant theme getting into 2024.

Has SAARC lived up to its expectation?

SAARC Charter Day is observed on December 8 by eight member countries. It is time to analyse its journey; what has been achieved and where it is headed



The South Asian Regional Cooperation also known as SAARC, is a regional cooperation comprising eight countries i.e. Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, Maldives, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. When SAARC was initially constituted in 1985, there were only seven member states however in 2007, Afghanistan was added to this regional grouping.

The SAARC was set up in order to ensure that economic, social and cultural development occurred in the region. However, over the last few years, we have seen a decline in any kind of engagement on these fronts. Further the major objective of ensuring that the living standards of the people has gone downhill and there have been blatant human rights violations in the region which has caused individuals to lose their dignity in a myriad of ways. Regional integrity which was the founding idea behind SAARC has faced a serious blow with the skirmishes and standoff between India and Pakistan. These conflicts have spill over into other avenues as well, which has effectively brought the SAARC functionalities to a grinding halt. Thus, also putting the peace and harmony of the region in jeopardy. The conflicts have prevented states from being able to build sustainable cooperation to promote economic, social or cultural development as a regional block. However, one must note that despite the fact that the regional block is not functioning as it was envisioned, states continue to have individual interactions with each other on various fronts of cooperation. The major driving factor behind the creation of SAARC was the acceleration of the process of economic growth. Further in order to realize this the SAARC states created an institutionalised regional economic cooperation through the Committee on Economic Cooperation.

The agenda for this committee was to promote various methods and ways through which economic and trade relations could be intensified. The biggest step undertaken by the committee towards helping realize this goal was the creation of the SAARC Preferential Trading Agreement (SAPTA) in 1993. The SAPTA came into force in 1995 with the sole goal of promoting free trade among the member states in the region. To a large extent, this Agreement can be credited for reducing the trade barriers in the region to a large extent and for kindling the fire of free trade in the region. The SAPTA was replaced by the South Asian Free Trade Area at the twelfth SAARC meeting which was held in Islamabad. The South Asian Free Trade Area (SAFTA) though signed in 2004 was operationalized in 2006 and for a while, it was able to promote trade in the region but has fallen flat at the present due to political conflicts that exist between the two nuclear power states of the South Asian region. Over the years both the SAPTA and the SAFTA have failed to achieve their goals of accelerated economic growth in the region. Further, the incapacitation of Afghanistan to act as a state the Taliban has ruined the economy of the state. However, there is a need to strengthen the SAFTA and create a more durable structure like that of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA). Drawing a parallel with recreating the same possibilities through SAFTA that the AfCFTA is set to bring to the region. According to a recent World Bank report the AfCFTA is set to boost the regional income by 7% which when converted to dollars amounts to \$450bn. Thus, impacting the quality of life of women, daily wage labourers and unskilled. This in turn enables the region to lift around 30 million people out of extreme poverty by 2035. The AfCFTA will be able to achieve this goal by diversifying exports,

accelerating growth, competitively integrating into the global economy and increasing foreign direct investment. If the SAARC could implement the SAFTA in a much more aggressive manner it would aid in the upliftment of around 736 million people living in extreme poverty in the South Asian Region. Terrorism is not something that is new to the region and is however something that is overlooked to a large extent. States in the region tend to engage and counter-terrorism as individual actors rather than work together collectively as a block to prevent this from escalating in the region. Terrorism and politically instigated violence is not something that is new to the region and has persisted from before the inception of the SAARC. There is a need for SAARC to contribute to the strengthening of practical and implementable counter-terrorism cooperation. The Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure (RATS) is a permanent organ of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) and it aims at the promotion of cooperation between member states against three identified tents of counter-terrorism i.e. terrorism, separatism and extremism. If the SAARC could create something similar to the RATS it would greatly benefit their current individualistic fight against terrorism. From the perspective of India, why does SAARC play an important role in the foreign policy of India? If the SAFTA is properly operationalized it would be able to achieve its goal which is to reduce the customs duties to zero in the region. Thus, enabling India to boost its economic growth not just in the region but internationally as well. Further, the framework agreement on energy cooperation in the South Asian


Region would enable India to mitigate the shortage faced in electricity production. Further, it would allow all member states to achieve their Nationally Determined Contributions under the Paris Accord as the electricity created under this Agreement leans towards green energy sourced from renewable sources. SAARC as an organisation had come up with a Visa exemption scheme wherein certain categories of dignitaries were exempted from Visas. If this idea is to see fruition there is a need for states to set aside their differences and work together. India has always been the forerunner of Space development initiatives and it would be an added feather to the cap of India if we could launch the SAARC regional satellite. It would also help boost the amity between the respective member states. Further, the revitalization of SAARC would play an important role in enabling India to curb the rampant spread of Chinese influence in the region. With the Chinese influence becoming stronger in Sri Lanka, Pakistan and Nepal, it is imperative for India to show these states that India can do for them what China offers as with the political tilt of various governments of the member states of SAARC the influence of China waxes and wanes. India needs to capitalise on this before it is too late and the damage is done. SAARC as a regional grouping is still of incredible importance. It is true that SAARC as a regional grouping is dormant now. However, we must not lose hope as the revitalisation of SAARC is in our best interest and could change the way we are perceived on international platforms.

Road safety: Rising accidents is a cause of concern

In the last few years, the nation has witnessed an alarming surge in road mishaps, surpassing even China in harrowing game of road safety roulette

According to the annual report on road accidents in India, 2022 released by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, the grim reality reveals a huge toll on lives and resources. A staggering 461,312 incidents were reported in 2022 alone, resulting in a catastrophic loss of 168,491 lives and causing injuries to 443,312 individuals. Shockingly, these figures depict an alarming escalation of 11.9% in accidents, 9.4% in fatalities, and 15.3% in injuries compared to the previous year, underscoring the gravity of the situation. These figures carry far more significance than just numbers; they stand for broken lives, devastated families, and a massive socio-economic

burden on society. Every victim of road accidents serves as a stark reminder of how vital it is to deal with this growing emergency. The question now becomes apparent: Why is our nation, known for its inventiveness and resourcefulness, unable to address this issue and provide an appropriate and effective solution to the growing menace of road accidents? This situation seems to be the result of several circumstances, including a mix of careless driving, speeding, intoxication, and a disregard for following traffic regulations. This, together with insufficient enforcement of traffic laws and lack of awareness among people, keeps the situation dangerous on India's highways.



It is obvious that for ensuring road safety, improving the condition of the road networks is crucial. Dangers for commuters are further compounded by poorly maintained roads, inadequate signages, insufficient illumination, and a dearth of separate

pedestrian sidewalks and cyclist pathways. Furthermore, a plausible factor contributing to this menace is the ease of getting a license by people as well as the faulty administrative procedure for issuing driving licenses in India. There are apparent loopholes and variations in the driving examinations for issuing licenses in different Indian states. The procedure for obtaining driver's licenses may further vary from district to district. In certain places, it is fairly flexible, while in others, it is quite rigid. Here, the role of corruption, assumingly prevalent in local offices, cannot be denied which, probably, becomes a cause of issuing licenses to undeserving persons, who, through their negligent driving, put the lives of others in danger. This is not a secret that driving licenses can be obtained relatively easily in our country. On the contrary, getting a driver's license in countries such as Germany is almost akin to a quest for a holy grail. In Germany, getting a driver's license is considered one of the toughest jobs as it requires passing highly difficult tests and procedures. Moreover, a corruption-free system makes sure that people with full driving competence, capacity and skill as well as an understanding of road conditions only get a driver's license. Moreover, in Germany, detailed road safety regulations are in place which require the parties involved in an accident as well as those witnessing an accident on the road mandatorily to stop, notify the police, assist the victims and ensure that help arrives. Any contravention of such rules makes the violator liable for heavy penalties and punishments. Moreover, Indian laws for ensuring road safety need reforms, especially Indian penal laws. The lax colonial age law in this respect is usually misused and also lacks in creating an effective deterrence. For example, Section 304 A of the IPC allows for a maximum sentence of two years for causing death by negligence—a very short sentence, when compared to the current needs. The Motor Vehicle Act of 1988 also requires significant reforms. While the Act was amended and Section 134A was added to protect people who save the lives of others from criminal or civil liability as a result of the Save Life Foundation's PIL, no significant changes have been observed till now. Road safety must become a top priority as India moves forward on its path to development and global leadership. To ensure safer roads for all, it is essential to adopt a culture of responsible driving, support infrastructural improvements, push for strict policy reforms and enforce laws strictly.

Fighting between Israel and Hamas rages in Gaza's 2nd largest city

Israeli troops battled Hamas militants on Wednesday in the centre of the Gaza Strip's second-largest city, the military said. The ground offensive has sent tens of thousands of Palestinians fleeing to the territory's southernmost edge and prevented aid groups from delivering food, water and other supplies. Two months into the war, Israel's offensive into southern Gaza was bringing to Khan Younis the same fierce urban fighting and intensified bombardment that obliterated much of Gaza City and the north of the territory in recent weeks.

But in the south, the areas where Palestinians can seek safety are rapidly shrinking. Ahead of the assault, Israel urged residents to evacuate Khan Younis, the childhood home of two top Hamas leaders. But much of the city's population remains in place, along with large numbers who were displaced from northern

Gaza and are unable to leave or wary of fleeing to the disastrously overcrowded far south.

Cut off from outside aid, people in United Nations-run shelters in Khan Younis are fighting over food, said Nawraz Abu Libdeh, a shelter resident who has been displaced six times. "The hunger war has started," he said. "This is the worst of all wars."

The UN says some 1.87 million people — over 80 per cent of the population of 2.3 million — have already fled their homes, many of them displaced multiple times. Almost the entire population is now crowded into southern and central Gaza, dependent on aid.

Late Wednesday, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres used a rarely exercised power to warn the Security Council of an impending "humanitarian catastrophe" in Gaza and urged members to demand a cease-fire. He invoked Article 99 of the UN Charter, a step no UN chief has taken in half a century, which says the secretary-general may

inform the council of matters believed to threaten international peace and security.

Israel accused the UN chief of "a new moral low" and "bias against Israel". The United States signalled it would not support Security Council

action.

Earlier Wednesday, UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Volker Türk said, "Palestinians in Gaza are living in utter, deepening horror". Speaking at a news conference in Geneva, he said that

"my humanitarian colleagues have described the situation as apocalyptic".

Israel's campaign has killed more than 16,200 people in Gaza — most of them women and children — and wounded more than 42,000, the territory's Health Ministry said late Tuesday. The agency has said many are also trapped under rubble.

The ministry does not differentiate between civilian and combatant deaths.

Israel has vowed to fight on, saying it can no longer accept Hamas rule or the group's military presence in Gaza after the October 7 attack that triggered the war. Hamas and other militants killed about 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and took captive some 240 people in that attack.

An estimated 138 hostages remain in Gaza after more than 100 were freed during a cease-fire in late November. Their plight and accounts of rape and other atrocities committed during the rampage have deepened Israel's outrage

and further galvanized support for the war.

URBAN WARFARE NORTH AND SOUTH

The refugee camp within Khan Younis was the childhood home of Hamas' top leader in Gaza, Yehya Sinwar, and the group's military chief, Mohammed Deif, as well as other Hamas leaders — giving it major symbolic importance in Israel's offensive. Israeli military spokesperson Daniel Hagari said Sinwar is "not aboveground", he is underground, but would not elaborate on where Israel believes him to be. "Our job is to find Sinwar and kill him."

The military said its special forces at Khan Younis had broken through defense lines of Hamas fighters and were assaulting their positions in the city centre.

It said warplanes destroyed tunnel shafts and troops seized a Hamas outpost as well as several weapons caches. The Israeli accounts of the battle could not be independently confirmed.

Video released by the military showed commandos and troops moving amid sounds of gunfire down city streets strewn with wreckage and buildings with giant holes punched into them. Some took positions behind an earthen berm, while others inside a home fired out through a window, its flowered curtains fluttering around them.

Hagari said heavy fighting was also continuing in the north, in the Jabaliya refugee camp and the district of Shujaiya.

Hamas posted a video it said showed its fighters in Shujaiya moving through narrow alleys and wrecked buildings and opening fire with rocket-propelled grenades on Israel armoured vehicles. Several of the vehicles are shown bursting into flames.

Its account could not be independently confirmed. But Hamas' continuing ability to fight in areas where Israel entered with overwhelming force weeks ago signals that eradicating the group while

avoiding further mass casualties and displacement — as Israel's top ally, the US, has requested — could prove elusive. Israel accuses Hamas, which has ruled Gaza for 16 years, of using civilians as human shields when the militants operate in residential areas and blames that for the high civilian death toll. But Israel has not given detailed accounts of its individual strikes, some of which have levelled entire city blocks.

The military says 87 of its soldiers have been killed in the Gaza ground offensive. It also says some 5,000 militants have been killed, without saying how it arrived at its count.

PUSHED TO THE EDGE

Tens of thousands of people have fled from Khan Younis and other areas to Rafah, on Gaza's southern border with Egypt, the UN said.

Rafah, normally home to around 280,000 people, has already been packed with more than 470,000 who fled from other parts of Gaza.

Johnson denies he wanted to let Covid 'rip' through population

Former British Prime Minister Boris Johnson on Thursday rejected suggestions that he wanted to let COVID-19 "rip" through the population as he defended his handling of the pandemic during a second day of testimony at a public inquiry into the crisis.

Johnson shook his head and responded "No, no, no" as he was confronted with a series of diaries by his



chief scientific adviser that indicated he had argued in favour of letting the virus spread rapidly to increase immunity to COVID-19 rather than imposing further restrictions on the people of Britain.

The former prime minister, who is testifying under oath, said he was simply pushing scientists to explain why such a strategy wouldn't work as the government debated whether to impose a second national lockdown in the autumn of 2020 when infection rates were rising and vaccines weren't yet available.

Johnson said critics should look at his public statements and actions, rather than "people's jottings from meetings that I have been in" when they assess the government's response to the pandemic.

"I think, frankly, it does not do justice to

what we did — our thoughts, our feelings, my thoughts, my feelings — to say that we were remotely reconciled to fatalities across the country, or that I believed that it was acceptable to let it rip," a frustrated Johnson said under questioning from the inquiry's chief legal counsel, Hugo Keith.

Johnson's government implemented a series of less draconian measures including a 10 p.m. curfew, work from home advice and regionally targeted restrictions in September and October of 2020 before it finally imposed a second national lockdown on October 31.

Johnson defended his efforts to balance the health and economic impacts of COVID-19. He was grilled about his government's "Eat Out to Help Out" programme, which supported the hospitality industry by subsidising restaurant meals, and delays in

imposing a second national lockdown as infection rates began to rise toward the end of 2020.

Leading scientists have testified that they weren't part of the discussions on the program and that it was obvious it would increase transmission risks. Johnson said he had no reason to question the restaurant initiative.

"I must emphasise, it was not at the time presented to me as something that would add to the budget of risk," he said. His remarks came after weeks of testimony by other ministers, including former Health Secretary Matt Hancock, who said they sought to raise the alarm inside the government. Hancock argued that thousands of lives could have been saved by putting the country under a lockdown a few weeks earlier than the eventual date of March 23, 2020.

RWANDA DEPORTATION POLICY

Rishi Sunak's leadership in turmoil

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's leadership of the governing Conservative Party is facing turmoil on Thursday after a bruising Cabinet resignation and open attacks by backbenchers over his government's controversial policy to deport illegal migrants to Rwanda.

The 43-year-old British Indian prime minister is caught in the middle of two strands within his party, one on the extreme right voiced by sacked home secretary Suella Braverman calling for an extreme agenda to override legal challenges and the other more centrist view of the UK not being seen to breach its human rights obligations. The clash came to a head on Wednesday night when Robert Jenrick, someone seen as a Sunak ally, resigned as his Immigration Minister, declaring that his boss' new Safety of Rwanda Bill designed to over-

ride a Supreme Court block "does not go far enough".

"I cannot continue in my position when I have such strong disagreements with the direction of the government's policy on immigration," wrote Jenrick in his resignation letter to Sunak.

Describing the small boat crossings across the English Channel by illegal migrants as doing "untold damage" to the country, Jenrick insisted that the government needed to get much tougher against "highly contested interpretations of international law".

"I have therefore consistently advocated for a clear piece of legislation that severely limits the opportunities for domestic and foreign courts to block



or undermine the effectiveness of the policy. A bill of the kind you are proposing is a triumph of hope over experience," he added.

In his reply letter, Sunak countered by saying that the new bill would be "the toughest piece of illegal migration legislation ever put forward by a UK government" and that his former Cabinet ally's opposition to it was "based on a fundamental misunderstanding of the situation".

"If we were to oust the courts entirely, we would collapse the entire scheme. The Rwandan government has been clear that they would not accept the UK basing this scheme on legislation that could be considered in breach of our international law obligations.

There would be no point in passing a law that would leave us with nowhere to send people to," he claimed.

UK PM loses ally as immigration minister resigns

London (PTI): Britain's Immigration Minister Robert Jenrick has resigned from Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's Cabinet over "strong disagreements" with the government's Rwanda policy of deporting illegal migrants. Jenrick, who was seen as a Sunak ally until recently, Wednesday said he felt the emergency legislation presented in a parliamentary statement by his boss, Home Secretary James Cleverly, did not go far enough to end the "merry-go-round of legal challenges".

Sunak responded to his resignation by saying he was "disappointed" but that his reasoning to quit the post was "based on a fundamental misunderstanding of the situation".

"It is with great sadness that I have written to the Prime Minister to tender my resignation as Minister for Immigration", Jenrick said in a post on X after questions in the House of Commons where he was missing from the front bench.

"I cannot continue in my position when I have such strong disagreements with the direction of the government's policy on immigration," he said. Jenrick said that small boat crossings across the English Channel were doing "untold damage" to the country and the government needed to place "national interests above highly contested interpretations of international law".

"I have therefore consistently advocated for a clear piece of legislation that severely limits the opportunities for domestic and foreign courts to block or undermine the effectiveness of the policy," he wrote in his resignation letter to Sunak on Wednesday. "A bill of the kind you are proposing is a triumph of hope over experience," he added. In his reply, Sunak countered by saying that the new bill would be "the toughest piece of illegal migration legislation ever put forward by a UK government".

'Vegas shooter who killed 3 is professor'

Las Vegas (AP): Terrified students and professors covered in classrooms and dorms as a gunman roamed the floors of a University of Nevada, Las Vegas building, killing three people and critically wounding a fourth before dying in a shootout with police.

The gunman in Wednesday's shooting was a professor who had unsuccessfully sought a job at the school, a law enforcement official with direct knowledge of the investigation told The Associated Press.

He previously worked at East Carolina University in North Carolina, said the official, who spoke on the condition of anonymity because they weren't authorised to release the information publicly.

The attack was the worst shooting in the city since October 2017, when a gunman killed 60 people and wounded more than 400 after opening fire from the window of a room at Mandalay Bay casino on the world-famous Las Vegas Strip only a couple miles from the UNLV campus.

Lessons learned from that shooting — the deadliest in modern US history — helped authorities to work "seamlessly" in reacting to the UNLV attack, Sheriff Kevin McMahon said at a news conference.

At about 11:45 a.m., the gunman opened fire on the fourth floor of the building that houses UNLV's Lee Business School, then went to several other floors before he was killed in a shootout with two university police detectives outside the building, UNLV Police Chief Adam Garcia said.

Authorities gave the all-clear about 40 minutes after the first report of an active shooter.

Three people were killed and a fourth was hospitalized in critical but stable condition, police said. It wasn't immediately clear how many of the school's 30,000 students were on campus at the time, but McMahon said students had been gathered outside the building to eat and play games.

Vivek Ramaswamy calls Nikki Haley 'fascist, corrupt'

Calling her "fascist" and "corrupt," biotech entrepreneur Vivek Ramaswamy launched a tirade against his Republican presidential rival and fellow Indian-American Nikki Haley, who refrained from a verbal duel, saying it is not worth her time to respond to him.

Ramaswamy launched the volley of charges against the former South Carolina governor and US ambassador to the UN in Arizona during the Republican Party's fourth presidential debate, which was attended by just four candidates, the other two being former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie and Florida Governor Ron DeSantis.

The front-runner for the Republican Party's nomination, former President Donald Trump, skipped the debate once again and held a fundraiser in Florida instead.

Participating in the debate, Ramaswamy, 38, accused Haley of having "a corruption problem" and held up a pad of paper with "NIKKI = CORRUPT" written on it. This resulted in a mix of boos and cheers from the audience. He called her "a puppet" and accused her of "using identity politics" as "a

form of intellectual fraud."

"Nikki, you were bankrupt when you left the U.N. After you left the U.N., you became a military contractor," he started and recounted her journey to end with further allegation: "That math doesn't add up. It adds up to the fact that you are corrupt."

"It's not worth my time to respond to him," Haley, 51, said when asked by the moderator to respond to the allegations. However, Ramaswamy did not give up and continued to attack Haley.

"The only person more fascist than the Biden (US President Joe Biden) regime now is Nikki Haley, who thinks the government should identify every one of those individuals with an ID," he alleged. "That is not freedom, that is fascism, and she should come nowhere near the levers of power, let alone the White House," he said.

Ramaswamy was referring to a recent remark by Haley in which she said that social media users needed to be verified by name, "Every person on social media should be verified, by their name. That's, first of all, it's a national security threat. When you do that, all of a sudden, people have to stand by what they say," she said.

Turkish, Greek leaders signal improved relations between two NATO allies

After several years of strained relations that raised tensions to alarming levels, longtime regional rivals Greece and Turkey made a significant step on Thursday in mending ties during a visit to Athens by Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

Ahead of his one-day visit, Erdogan had promised a "win-win" approach that could lay the foundation for broader cooperation, with hopes of also resetting his country's ties with Western allies.

"It is natural for there to be problems between two countries, even more so among brothers," Erdogan said after meeting with Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis. "The issue is the will to resolve those problems and differences of opinion." With both leaders showing a marked departure from the testy, sometimes outright belligerent rhetoric of the last few years,

Erdogan said of the Aegean Sea through which the two NATO members' border runs: "We want to convert the Aegean into a sea of peace and cooperation. We wish to be an example to the world with the joint steps we will take as Turkey and Greece." "I say it openly," Erdogan said, according to a translation of his comments. "There is no problem between us so great that it cannot be resolved, provided we move with good faith and we focus on the big picture."

The longstanding disputes between Greece and Turkey have led the two countries to the brink of war three times in the last 50 years. Centring on maritime boundaries and exploration rights for resources in the Aegean Sea and eastern Mediterranean, the latest flare-up occurred in 2020, when navy ships from the two countries

shadowed each other in the eastern Mediterranean.

As relations deteriorated, Erdogan said as recently as last year that he no longer had any interest in meeting with Mitsotakis. But Thursday's visit will be the third time this year that Erdogan and Mitsotakis have met, signalling a significant push to improve ties.

"Our bilateral relations have experienced turbulence that at times have dangerously threatened them, and with them (threatened) security and peace in the Eastern Mediterranean," Mitsotakis said, addressing the Turkish president as "my dear president", and "Mr. President, dear Tayyip". Mitsotakis noted the importance of the "calmer path" that bilateral relations have been on over the past few months. "Greece and Turkey, Turkey and Greece should live in peace, express their known differences, discuss them honest-

Shah selected as BBC chairman

Dr Samir Shah, an Indian-born media executive with over 40 years of experience in TV production and journalism, has been named as the UK government's preferred candidate to take over as the new BBC chairman. The 71-year-old, who was honoured with a CBE (Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire) by Queen Elizabeth II in 2019 for services to television and heritage, will replace Richard Sharp, who was forced to resign after his communication with former prime minister Boris Johnson came under scrutiny.

Shah will now be quizzed by cross-party MPs of the House of Commons Media Culture, Media and Sport Select Committee for pre-appointment scrutiny before formally taking charge of the public service broadcaster.

"With a career spanning



more than 40 years in TV production and journalism, Dr Shah has a wealth of experience to bring to the position of BBC Chair," UK Culture Secretary Lucy Frazer said on Wednesday, confirming the selection as per the appointment process.

"He has a clear ambition to see the BBC succeed in a rapidly changing media landscape, and I have no doubt he will provide the support and scrutiny that the BBC needs to meet

the challenges and opportunities of the future," she said.

The minister said Shah's knowledge of the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) and his belief in its role as a national broadcaster alongside his extensive work to promote diversity in broadcasting will be invaluable in helping to ensure that the BBC reflects, represents and serves communities across the whole of the UK.

"The BBC is, without doubt, one of the greatest contributions we have made to global culture and one of our strongest calling cards on soft power," Shah said.

"If I am able to put what skills, experience, and understanding of public service broadcasting I have built up during my career to help this brilliant organisation meet the complex and diverse challenges it faces over the coming years, it would be an honour," he added.

US military grounds entire fleet of Osprey aircraft

Washington (AP): The military announced late Wednesday it was grounding all of its Osprey V-22 helicopters, one week after eight Air Force Special Operations Command service members died in a crash off the coast of Japan.

The Air Force, Navy and Marine Corps took the extraordinary step of grounding hundreds of aircraft after a preliminary investigation of last week's crash indicated that a materiel failure — that something went wrong with the aircraft — and not a mistake by the crew led to the deaths.

The crash raised new questions about the safety of the Osprey, which has been involved in multiple fatal accidents over its relatively short time in service. Japan grounded its fleet of 14 Ospreys after the crash. Lt. Gen. Tony

Bauernfeind, head of Air Force Special Operations Command, directed the shutdown "to mitigate risk while the investigation continues," the command said in a statement. "Preliminary investigation information indicates a potential materiel failure caused the mishap, but the underlying cause of the failure is unknown at this time."

In a separate notice, Naval Air Systems Command said it was grounding all Ospreys. The command is responsible for the Marine Corps and Navy variants of the aircraft.

The Air Force said it was unknown how long the aircraft would be grounded. It said the shutdown was expected to remain in place until the investigation determined the cause of the Japan crash and made recommendations to allow the fleet to return to operations.

Divides over trade, Ukraine in focus as EU, China's leaders meet

Atop European Union official told Chinese leader Xi Jinping on Thursday that China and the EU must address both the imbalances in their trading relationship and Russian aggression against Ukraine.

The two are divided on both issues. European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen, meeting Xi in the Chinese capital, said they need to manage their differences responsibly.

"China is the EU's most important trading partner," von der Leyen said in opening remarks posted on the commission's website. "But there are clear imbalances and differences that we must address."

Xi said that China and the EU should handle their differences through dialogue, and pushed back against what his government sees as a shift in European policy on China toward a more strident and competitive approach. The two sides "should not regard each other as rivals because of different systems, reduce cooperation because of competition,

and confront each other because of differences," he said, according to state broadcaster CCTV.

The meeting comes a day after EU member Italy announced it was withdrawing from Xi's signature "Belt and Road" initiative that aims to build a global network of Chinese-financed roads, ports and power plants. Italy became the first G7 country to sign on to the initiative in 2019, when the government at the time promoted it as a way of increasing trade with China while getting investments in major infrastructure projects.

Neither outcome materialized. In the intervening years, Italy's trade deficit with China has ballooned from 20 billion euros to 48 billion euros (USD 21.5 billion to USD 51.8 billion.) Foreign Ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin defended the initiative and appeared to imply that Italy had been influenced by forces hostile to China.

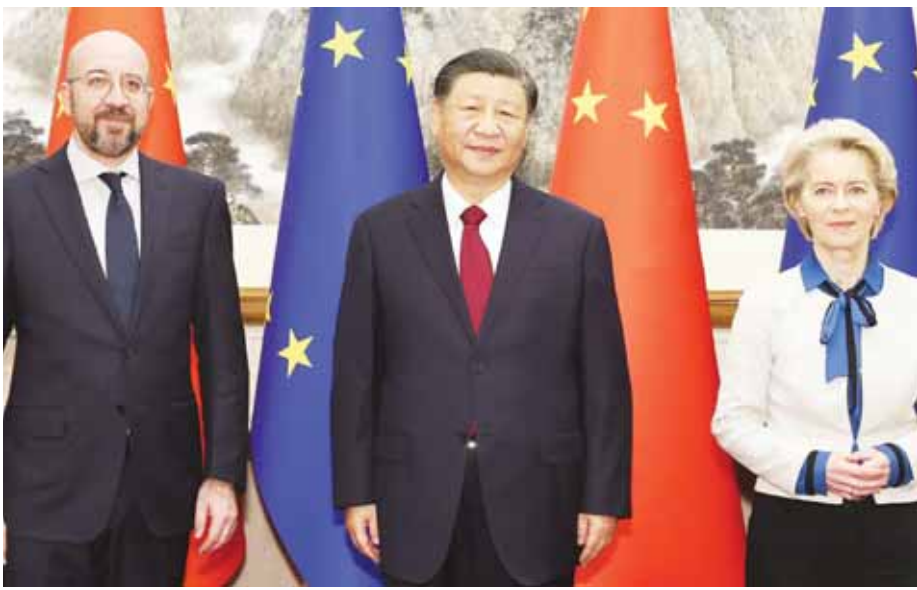
"China firmly opposes smearing and undermining cooperation in building the Belt and Road and opposes

stoking bloc confrontation and divisions" Wang said at a daily briefing on Thursday.

After nearly three years of self-imposed isolation during the COVID-19 pandemic that took a heavy toll on its economy, and having adopted an assertive foreign policy that seeks to challenge the US-led world order, China now appears to be taking a slightly more moderate tone.

Xi held four hours of talks with US President Joe Biden last month in California in their first face-to-face meeting in a year, with the leaders vowing to stabilise their fraught relationship. Von der Leyen and Charles Michel, the president of the EU Council, met Xi in the morning and were meeting with China's No. 2 leader, Premier Li Qiang, later in the day. Von der Leyen, as commission president, heads the day-to-day business of the EU, while Michel chairs the summits of EU leaders.

The talks were "candid, frank, in-depth and constructive," Wang Lutong, director general of the Foreign Ministry's European

Department, told reporters following the meetings. He repeated China's call for an immediate cease-fire in Ukraine and the opening of talks between Western leaders

and Russian President Vladimir Putin.

Dialogue on human rights, economic cooperation, people-to-people exchanges, open trade, the environment, food

security and China's claim to Taiwan were also discussed, Wang said. The European Union is calling on China to improve market access for products from its 27 member

US House motion urges Pak to uphold democratic institutions, human rights

A resolution has been introduced in the US House of Representatives urging Pakistan to uphold democratic institutions, human rights, and the rule of law, as the cash-strapped country prepares for general elections in February.

The resolution introduced in the House of Representatives by Congressman Mitch McCormick and Congressman Dan Kildee this week affirmed its strong support for democracy in Pakistan, including free and fair elections reflecting the will of the people of Pakistan. It also called on the President and the Secretary of State to work with the Government of Pakistan to ensure democracy, human rights, and the rule of law are upheld.

The resolution that has been sent to the House Foreign Affairs Committee "urges the Government of Pakistan to uphold democratic institutions, human rights, and the rule of law, and respect the fundamental guarantees of due process, freedom of the press, freedom of assembly, and freedom of speech of the people of Pakistan."

It condemns attempts to suppress the people of Pakistan's participation in their democracy, including through harassment, intimidation, arbitrary detention, or any violation of their human, civil, or political rights; and condemns any effort to subvert the political, electoral, or judicial processes of Pakistan. The resolution comes at a time when Pakistan, which is facing both political and economic instability, is preparing to hold the general election on February 8.

Sharif's appeal against conviction in Al-Azizia case to be heard on merit

In some relief to former Pakistan prime minister Nawaz Sharif, the Islamabad High Court on Thursday decided to hear on merit an appeal by him against his conviction in the Al-Azizia Steel mill corruption case as he eyes a record fourth term as premier in the next elections.

Sharif, 73, was sentenced to seven years in jail and imposed a heavy fine by an anti-corruption court in December 2018 after he failed to convince the court that he had nothing to do with the steel mill set up by his father in 2001 in Saudi Arabia.

A division bench comprising IHC Chief Justice Aamer Farooq and Justice Miangul Hassan Aurang-zeb announced the decision. The same bench had acquitted the former premier in the Avenfield case on November 29. After hearing

arguments, the bench rejected a plea by the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) to send back the case to the trial court for its re-trial. The decision by the IHC means that it would hear the actual substance of the case, including the charge, the defence and the weight of evidence, and not just focus on matters of procedure or jurisdiction. The former premier was present at the time of the hearing and should have been relieved by the court's decision to hear the appeal on merit as he had already been acquitted in the Avenfield case which like the Al-Azizia steel mill case is based on allegation of assets beyond means. Sharif was living in exile in Saudi Arabia at the time the mill was set up after the former military ruler Pervez Musharraf toppled his government in 1999 and bundled out of the country the former first family. Sharif's

son Hussain Nawaz was the administrative head of the mill.

The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) maintained that the mill was established by using the corruption money Sharif accumulated during his rule, a charge he denied saying that part of the funds for the facility were provided by the Saudi government. It was also stated during the hearing that the Qatari royal family had invested in the mill while Sharif's father Muhammad Sharif chipped in with USD 5 million as his share. However, the defence side failed to provide credible proof of funds used to set up the mill and the former premier was declared as guilty. Sharif filed an appeal in the Islamabad High Court but he left Pakistan in 2019 and the process was stalled as he was declared absconder for failing to appear in the court. On his return in October after more

than four years, his appeal was revived and not up for hearing.

He was already acquitted in the Avenfield case in which he was convicted in July 2018 and sentenced to ten years in Jail. He also got relief in the Flagship corruption case in which he was declared innocent by the court in 2018 but the acquittal was challenged in the IHC by the NAB. Sharif, the only Pakistani politician who became the prime minister of the coup-prone country for a record three times, returned to the country in October to lead his party in general elections scheduled in February 2024.

Last week, the anti-corruption watchdog withdrew its appeal and Sharif's innocence was restored in the case. Sharif landed into hot waters in 2017 when he was disqualified by the Supreme Court following a protracted tussle with the military establishment.

Court asks ISI chief to submit report on audio leak of call between Imran's wife, her lawyer

The Islamabad High Court on Thursday asked the ISI chief Lieutenant General Nadeem Anjum to submit a report on who was behind the alleged leaked audio of a call between former prime minister Imran Khan's wife Bushra Bibi and her lawyer Latif Khosa. The court also asked the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) to conduct audio forensics of the leaked call between the former first lady and her counsel to probe the origins of its release, Geo News reported.

Justice Babar Sattar issued the order during the hearing of a petition filed by Khosa against the leaked audio between him and his client. Justice Sattar also directed for a copy of the plea to be sent to the Director-General of Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) Lt Gen Anjum, seeking a report from the spy chief with findings detailing who was behind the audio leak.

The court also issued notices to FIA, Pakistan Electronic Media Regulatory Authority (Pemra), and Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA), seeking their response on the matter. The court adjourned the hearing of the case till December 11.

During the proceedings on Thursday, Justice Sattar questioned how private conversations of people were being broadcast on television channels. He also overruled the objections to the application. "What is the registrar's office's objection to the application?" he asked. Khosa, in his reply to the judge, said the objection is on filing a miscellaneous application and not a separate plea. "A miscellaneous petition can be filed in the audio leaks case." The lawyer said that counsel-client conversations are privileged. "Big Boss is listening to everything, you must know this," Justice Sattar quipped, leaving the courtroom with laughter. He then

asked who was recording the audio, in reply to which Khosa said, "Everyone knows who records."

The judge emphasised that the court could not work on assumptions. Khosa, who is also representing the former Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chairman, in multiple cases, said the matter was not only concerning for him but for all lawyers across Pakistan.

"How will the justice system work if a lawyer cannot talk to his client freely?" he asked. The judge then inquired if the audio surfaced on social media. "Audio was also aired by all TV channels," Khosa replied. "Did it first surfaced on Twitter or elsewhere," Justice Sattar inquired, probing the platform where the audio first surfaced. He said it was possible to find out who recorded the audio if the origins of its release were distinguished. Khosa censured Pemra for its ignorance while news channels ran the audio leak on air.

"Otherwise, Pemra turns off the screen upon taking someone's name [on-air]," the lawyer said. Khosa also complained that people have stopped talking to him over a phone call as his mobile set is no longer safe.

On Wednesday, Khosa filed a petition against the audio leak of his conversation with Bushra Bibi, requesting the court to ask respondents, delinquent authorities, officials and agencies not to tape the former first lady's telephone calls nor telecast or print it in the electronic, print or social media. The plea, filed on behalf of Khan's wife, sought action against those behind leaking the conversation.

"It is further prayed that to stem the illegal intrusion into the petitioner's privacy of communication through cell/telephone or otherwise the respondents be directed to remove the surveillance gadgets/devices and those found involved be directed to be prosecuted under the law," the petition read.

Russian lawmakers on Thursday set the date of the country's 2024 presidential election for March 17, moving Vladimir Putin a step closer to a fifth term in office.

Members of the Federation Council, Russia's upper house of parliament, voted unanimously to approve a decree setting the date. "In essence, this decision marks the start of the election campaign," said Valentina Matviyenko, speaker of the Federation Council. Russia's central election commission is to hold a meeting on the presidential campaign on Friday. Putin, 71, hasn't yet announced his intention to run again, but is widely expected to do so in the coming days now that the date has been set.

Under constitutional reforms he orchestrated, he is eligible to seek two more six-year terms after his current one expires next year, potentially allowing him to remain in power until 2036. Having established tight control over Russia's political system, Putin's victory in the

March election is all but assured. Prominent critics who could challenge him on the ballot are either in jail or living abroad, and most independent media have been banned. Neither the costly, drawn-out war in Ukraine, nor a failed rebellion last summer by mercenary chief Yevgeny Prigozhin appear to have affected his high approval ratings reported by independent pollsters. In 2012, the Kremlin's United Russia party nominated him, so he didn't need them. The central election commission plans online voting in addition to traditional paper ballots in about 30 Russian regions and is considering stretching the voting across three days -- a practice that was adopted during the pandemic and widely criticized by independent election monitors. Those measures on top of restrictions on monitoring adopted in recent years will severely limit the possibility of independent observers, according to Stanislav Adnrechuk, co-chair of Golos, a prominent independent election monitoring group.

Russian schoolgirl shoots classmate dead, kills self

Investigative Committee said. The girl's father was taken for questioning as a witness, RIA Novosti said. Investigators also wanted to ask him how his daughter came into possession of the gun, the Telegram channel Shot reported. The presidential Children's Rights Commissioner, Maria Lvova-Belova said on her Telegram channel that she was overseeing the care of the injured children. Agnes Chow says she still feels under watch of Hong Kong police in Canada

AP ■ BANGKOK

Pro-democracy activist Agnes Chow, who left Hong Kong for Canada and doesn't plan to return to fulfil her bail conditions, said on Thursday she still feels under the watch of the Chinese territory's police after moving to Toronto. Chow is one of Hong Kong's most prominent young activists and was arrested in 2020 under a Beijing-imposed national security law that was enacted following 2019 anti-government protests.

While she has not been charged and was released on bail, police confiscated her passport before returning it to her this year under certain conditions, including a visit to mainland China with author-

ities. Chow said in an interview with The Associated Press that Hong Kong's national security police called her twice to ask her about her status after she left the city to pursue further studies in September.

"They keep trying to make me feel like I'm under their eyes," she said. The intimidation of Hong Kong dissidents like Chow reflects the severe erosion of the freedoms promised to the former British colony when it returned to China in 1997. But both the Beijing and Hong Kong governments have hailed the security law, saying it brought back stability to the city.

On Tuesday, Hong Kong leader John Lee hit out at Chow's decision to not return to Hong Kong to meet her bail

conditions. He called Chow a "liar" and said attempts by police to offer her lenient treatment eventually led to them being deceived. Chow will be pursued for life unless she turns herself in, he said.

Chow rejected the government's claim that police had offered her leniency, insisting her personal safety and freedom had been infringed. She said the restrictions imposed by the authorities on her daily life had badly affected her mental health.

She said in an Instagram post on Sunday that her passport was only returned to her so she could pursue a master's degree after she agreed to go to mainland China with national security authorities. During that trip in August, she visited

to an exhibition on China's achievements and the headquarters of tech giant Tencent, she said. She was asked to pose for photos.

Later, police asked her to write a thank you letter to them before returning her passport to her, she said.

Chow pondered for "a really long time" whether to publicise her experience. She said her trip showed the Hong Kong police were adopting more of the style of mainland Chinese authorities to "control" and "intimidate" political dissidents. "If I did not make my story public, these photos, these letters might one day become the evidence of my patriotism. That is something I do not want to see," she said.

Chinese navy ships first to dock at new pier at Cambodian naval base linked to Beijing

Phnom Penh (AP): Chinese naval vessels have become the first ships to dock at a new pier at a Cambodian naval base that the United States and some international security analysts say is destined to serve as a strategic outpost for Beijing's navy. The docking of the two ships, which received little publicity, coincided with an official visit to Cambodia this week by China's top defense official, Vice Chairman of the Central Military Commission He Weidong.

News of at least two Chinese ships docking at the Ream Naval Base on the Gulf of Thailand came out indirectly, through a Facebook post on Sunday by Cambodian Defense Minister

Tea Seiha. It said he visited the base to see preparations for Cambodian navy training and to inspect progress on infrastructure construction, but did not mention China by name. He also posted photos showing Cambodian officials with Chinese Ambassador Wang Wentian, and reviewing Chinese sailors. At least two warships could be seen in the photos, one whose gangway identified it as the Chinese navy corvette Wenshan.

Satellite photos taken Sunday by Planet Labs PBC analyzed by The Associated Press show what appear to be two Chinese warships docked at the base. They correspond to the images shared online by Tea Seiha.

No spectacular announcement in February budget: Sitharaman

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Thursday ruled out any “spectacular announcement” for her sixth budget on February 1 next year, saying it would just be a vote on account before the general elections. A full Budget for the 2024-25 fiscal would be presented in July next year by the new government elected after the April-May general elections, she said at the CII Global Economic Policy Forum. “I am not going to play a spoilsport, but it is a matter of truth that the February 1, 2024, budget that will be announced will just be a vote on account

because we will be in an election mode. So the budget that the government presents will just be to meet the expenditure of the government till a new government comes to play,” she said. “No spectacular announcements come in that time (in a vote on account). So you will have to wait till after the new government comes in and presents the next full Budget in July 2024,” Sitharaman said in reply to a question on whether she would announce a “super-charged budget” in February. Piyush Goyal, who was holding additional charge of the Ministry of Finance after Arun Jaitley fell ill, had presented the last interim budget in 2019.



After the Narendra Modi-led government swept to power for the second straight time, Sitharaman was appointed as the finance minister and she presented the full budget on July 5, 2019. Traditionally, a vote on account

is an authorisation for incurring certain expenditures required till a new government takes office. Governments in the past have refrained from making any major policy announcement during the vote on account, but there is no constitutional bar from making big announcements. Goyal had announced a Rs 6,000 per year cash dole to 12 crore farmers in the interim Budget 2019. Goyal had also announced tax sops for the middle class, including hiking the standard deduction available to the salaried class to Rs 50,000, from Rs 40,000. Also, a full tax rebate was

announced for individual taxpayers having taxable annual income of up to Rs 5 lakh. The 2019 interim budget had proposed that such taxpayers would not be required to pay any income tax. Also, ministers have made political speeches which some saw as a pitch for re-election. Before the vote on account, Governments also do not present the customary pre-budget Economic Survey that traditionally is presented a day before the presentation of the full budget. The survey which details the state of the economy and directional events, is presented when the full budget is tabled in Parliament in July.



Stock markets snap seven days winning run; Sensex falls 132 points

Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty snapped their seven-day winning streak on Thursday due to profit taking by investors after recent sharp gains triggered by negative cues from Asian markets. The 30-share BSE Sensex fell 132.04 points, or 0.19 per cent, to close at 69,521.69. The gauge hit the lowest intra-day level of 69,320.53. Broader index Nifty also declined 36.55 points, or 0.17 per cent, to settle at 20,901.15. Analysts said crude oil prices in international markets failed to boost sentiment amid selling pressure from foreign institutional investors even as traders stayed on the sidelines ahead of RBI's monetary policy decision. The Reserve Bank of India is expected to maintain the status quo on the interest rate in its bi-monthly monetary policy decision to be announced on Friday. Major laggards among Sensex constituents included Bharti Airtel, Hindustan Unilever, Tata Steel and ITC. Power Grid, UltraTech Cement, NTPC and Titan emerged as winners. As many as 17 shares of the 30-share Sensex ended the session in red, while 23 Nifty firms closed lower. According to Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services, the market took a breather as investors are in a wait-and-watch mode ahead of the monetary policy announcement. “A better-than-estimated Q2 GDP growth, ease in global oil

prices and drop in global bond yield will be the silver lining for the MPC. However, the expectation of a rise in domestic November inflation, drop in Rabi cultivation and increase in foodgrain prices will influence RBI to adopt a cautious approach in the short-term,” he said. About the movement in Nifty, Rupak De, Senior Technical analyst at LKP Securities, said the index hovered within the bands of 20850-20950 as “sentiment remains somewhat cautious ahead of the RBI policy meet”. “The near-term trend remains sideways to weak as long as it stays below 21000, a psychologically crucial level. A decisive breakout above 21000 might induce a resumption of the uptrend. Until then, we anticipate weakness over the near term,” he said. In the broader market, the BSE largecap index moved up marginally by 0.02 per cent, the midcap gauge gained 0.66 per cent and smallcap advanced by 0.28 per cent. Among sectoral indices, FMCG, metal and teck declined by 0.85 per cent, 0.75 per cent and 0.38 per cent respectively. In contrast, utilities and power defied the trend and surged by 3.16 per cent and 2.67 per cent, respectively. Besides, services gained 1.63 per cent, cosumer durables rose 1.22 per cent and oil & gas jumped 1.00 per cent. Meanwhile, in Asian markets, Nikkei 225 declined by 1.79 per cent. Hong Kong's Hang Seng was off 0.73 per cent and China's Shanghai Composite fell 0.09 per cent.

One97 Communications stock settles 19 per cent lower

Shares of One97 Communications, parent firm of Paytm, settled 19 per cent lower on Thursday, a day after the company announced it will focus on high-ticket lending and go slow on loans that are less than Rs 50,000. The scrip of the company nosedived 18.74 per cent to close at Rs 660.70 apiece on the NSE. On the BSE, Paytm shares tumbled 18.69 per cent to end at Rs 661.30 per share. During the day, the scrip of Paytm plunged 20 per cent to hit the lower circuit of Rs 650.65 and 650.45 per piece on BSE and NSE, respectively. On the volume front, 3.68 crore shares were traded on the NSE, and 48.50 lakh shares changed hands on the BSE, during the day. At the end of the session, the 30-share BSE Sensex fell 132.04, or 0.19 per cent lower to settle at 69,521.69 points, while Nifty slipped 36.55 points to 20,901.15. On Wednesday, One97 Communications, which operates under the Paytm brand,



said it will focus on high-ticket loans and go slow on loans that are less than Rs 50,000. “We are seeing better performance on the merchant side than the consumer side. “We will try to do a lot more there. Our focus now on the calibration of business is on high ticket, slowing down to less than Rs 50,000,” Paytm's President and Chief Operating Officer Bhavesh Gupta said at an analyst call on Wednesday. He said postpaid loans will gradually start reducing in the overall lending business. The company acquires 3.5-4 lakh new postpaid loan customers on an average every month, out of which around 70 per cent opted for borrowing of less than Rs 50,000.

‘Levying border adjustment tax to meet green commitments morally wrong’

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Thursday said any move on imposition of cross-border adjustment tax by developed countries to meet their green commitments is morally wrong and goes against the interest of developing countries of ‘Global South’. “The single mono-sided decision of imposition of border adjustment tax ...The logic just goes against the concern of the Global South...” “But cross-border imposition (of tax) and that money going towards somebody else's green agenda, if anything, is not moral at all,” Sitharaman said at the CII Global Economic Policy Forum. The minister said every country will need to generate resources to meet the green commitments made globally. Her comments come in the backdrop of the European Union's announcement to impose carbon tax on imports from certain sectors. The CBAM (Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism) or carbon tax (a kind of import duty) will come into effect from January 1, 2026, but from October 1 this year, domestic companies from seven carbon-intensive sectors, including steel, cement, fertiliser, aluminium and hydrocarbon prod-



ucts, will have to share data with regard to carbon emissions with the EU. In her address, Sitharaman said the base energy requirements of a country cannot be filled by renewable energy sources, but it is possible to think in terms of spreading renewable energy in such a way that individual participation is ensured. India is rapidly moving in the renewable energy space, particularly in solar, and is in talks with many countries for a grid connectivity across the world by the ISA members.

Hyundai to increase vehicle prices from January 1

Automaker Hyundai Motor India Ltd on Thursday said it will hike the prices of its vehicles from next month citing rising input cost, adverse exchange rate and increase in commodity prices. The company, which sells a range of vehicles starting from Grand i10 Nios to electric SUV IONIQ5, priced between Rs 5.84 lakh to Rs 45.95 lakh, however, did not specify the quantum of the proposed price increase to be effective from January 1, 2024. The price increase is owing to rising input cost, adverse exchange rate and increase in commodity prices, amongst other reasons, Hyundai Motor India Ltd (HMIL), said in a statement. HMIL COO Tarun Garg, COO said the company always tries to absorb the cost escalations to the extent possible and ensure customers are not burdened. “However, it has now become imperative to pass on some portion of the rising input cost to the market through a minor price increase,” he added. HMIL said it will continue to make consistent internal efforts to minimize future price impact to customers. The company joins the likes of Maruti Suzuki, Tata Motors, Mahindra & Mahindra, Honda and Audi among others which have also announced plans to increase vehicle prices in January.

Sunsure Energy partners Sandoz India for 31 million units of green power

Sunsure Energy on Thursday said it will supply 31 million units of green power to Sandoz India for a period of 25 years. The company will supply power to the facility of the pharma player in Maharashtra, Sunsare Energy said in a statement. Sunsare Energy partners with Sandoz India for the supply of renewable energy from a 20 MW solar power plant. It will supply over 31 million units of green energy annually for the next 25 years, the statement said. The partnership will enable Sandoz India to offset 26 million kg of Co2 annually. “Sunsure will set up this captive renewable energy plant with Sandoz India as the sole user of power. This green power commitment will be fulfilled through Open Access supply of power to Sandoz India's facilities in Maharashtra,” the statement said. Shashank Sharma, Founder-Chairman and CEO, Sunsare Energy, said, “This partnership stands as a significant stride towards advancing the adoption of green energy in the pharmaceutical sector in India and globally.”

‘Hiring activity for white collar jobs dips 12 per cent during October, November’

Hiring activity for white-collar jobs witnessed a 12 per cent on-year decline during October-November largely due to fall in recruitment trends in IT-Software, telecom and education sectors, a report said on Thursday. White-collar recruitment during October-November declined by 12 per cent with 2,433 job postings, compared to 2,781 during the corresponding months in 2022, according to the Naukri JobSpeak Index. The Naukri JobSpeak is a monthly Index representing the state of the Indian job market and hiring activity based on new job listings and job-related searches by recruiters on the resume database of Naukri.Com. While, telcom, education, retailing sectors witnessed 18 per cent, 17 per cent and 11 per cent decline, respectively, during October-November compared with the same months in 2022, sectors like hospitality, travel, auto and auto ancillary the hiring trend was stagnant, the report said. Meanwhile, Oil and Gas sectors recorded 9 per cent increase in hiring in the October-November period compared to



the last year, on the back of rapid expansion by energy companies and the setting up of new refineries across the country, the report noted. Similarly, the Pharma sector registered a 6 per cent increase in new job offers in the October-November against the same months of 2022, it added. The report further revealed that the insurance sector also saw positive momentum as hiring grew by 5 per cent in the October-November period, over the same period last year. “It was encouraging to see core non-IT sectors like Oil and Gas, Pharma and Insurance growing at a healthy clip during a cluttered festive

period. November's 1 per cent growth in IT vs October could be a much awaited positive sign, as we eagerly await next month's trends,” Naukri.Com Chief Business Officer Pawan Goyal said. The overall hiring in the IT sector was 22 per cent lower in the October-November, compared to the same months last year, it noted. However, despite witnessing substantial corrections in the first half of 2023, the sector reported a 1 per cent growth in November over October. New job openings in AI-related fields like machine learning engineer and full stack data scientist increased by 64 per cent

and 16 per cent respectively during the two months under review, compared to the year-ago period, the report said. Meanwhile, when it came to cities the non-metros, once again, outperformed the metros in terms of hiring. Vadodara clocked a 9 per cent growth in new job offers in the last two-months against the same period of 2022, while Ahmedabad stayed flat. Metros like Delhi NCR and Mumbai clocked negative growth of 12 per cent each, while the IT-focused cities of Bangalore, Hyderabad, Chennai, and Pune recorded negative growth of 20 per cent, 18 per cent, 21 per cent, and 18 per cent in October-November compared to the same period of 2022. The report also found that organisations continued to show preference for senior professionals in terms of hiring, a trend seen in most of 2023. Hiring for senior professionals with more than 16 years of experience went up by 26 per cent in the last two months against the same months of 2022. While, for freshers, new offers recorded negative growth of 13 per cent in the last two-month over the same period last year, the report added.

Monthly average office rent up 7 per cent annually in April, September: Anarock

Rentals for prime office spaces rose by an average 7 per cent year-on-year to 83 per square feet per month across seven major cities during the first six months of the current fiscal on rise in construction cost, according to Anarock. Real estate consultant Anarock on Thursday released its India Office Market Update for H1 (April-September) of 2023-24 fiscal, stating that Grade A office rental values averaged at Rs 83 per square feet per month across seven major cities against Rs 77.5 per square feet in the year-ago period. The first half of this fiscal year remained lacklustre for commercial office space activity across the top seven cities, with both net absorption and new completions remaining largely stagnant compared to the same period last year. New office supply rose 5 per cent and net office absorption saw a marginal decline of 1 per cent during the period under review, the consultant pointed out.



“Interestingly, average rental values across the top 7 cities witnessed a 7 per cent growth in H1 FY24, as compared to the same period in FY23, essentially due to increased construction and input costs,” Anarock Regional Director & Head - Research Prashant Thakur said. During the April-September period of this fiscal, Chennai witnessed the highest 10 per cent year-on-year increase in average monthly office rental values to Rs 68 per sq ft from Rs 62 per square feet in the year-ago period. Hyderabad saw a 8 per cent increase in average rent to Rs 66 from Rs 61 per square feet. Bengaluru, Pune, and Kolkata each saw 7 per cent

annual growth in office rent, while Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR) and Delhi-NCR registered 5 per cent increase each. Average monthly office rental in Bengaluru rose to Rs 90 per square feet from Rs 84 per square feet. In Pune, the average office rental grew to Rs 79 from Rs 74 per square feet a month, while in Kolkata rentals increased to Rs 58 per sq ft from Rs 54 per square feet. MMR, the most expensive office market in the country, saw rental increasing to Rs 136 per square feet from Rs 130 per sq ft. In NCR, the average office rentals rose to Rs 85 from Rs 81 per square feet.

India a labour rich country with enough institutional maturity

India has the potential to grow at 8 per cent as the country is labour-rich with enough institutional maturity of a functioning democracy, Niti Aayog vice chairman Suman Bery said on Thursday. Bery also cautioned that North India has not been doing well traditionally compared to South India, and this can create tensions in a federal polity.

“So, 8 per cent growth or something approximating that means continuous change that needs to be politically managed,” he said while addressing the Global Economic Policy Forum 2023, organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) and the finance ministry. According to Bery, the modernisation journey of India is unusual and unique. “And if I wanted to bet on India for the next 25 years, I

would point to first, the fact that we are not labour constrained in a world which is increasingly labour constrained. But much more importantly...We have the institutional maturity of a functioning democracy with established rules of the game for the transfer of power we have just seen magnificently in the state elections,” he added. Bery noted that economic growth in a country like India



is a prerequisite for equity. “So, growth is not an end in itself, but it is a means to an end to raise living standards and secure India's strategic and institutional economy,” he said. Bery pointed out that India is the fastest-growing major economy but still the lowest per capita income country in the G20. “Growth needs to be both inclusive as well as pro-people, and women-led growth will be

critical for attaining positive outcomes. “The challenge is to use the mature institutional democratic structure of India to realise its potential in the Amrit Kaal,” the Niti Aayog vice chairman said. He emphasised that growth must be prioritised to achieve domestic and international objectives of higher living standards and securing India's strategic and institutional economy.

Bery also said it is important to strike the right balance between facilitation and regulation at the Union and state levels to realise India's potential. “It is important to link both the personal as well as spatial dimensions of inequality,” he said and highlighted the importance of effective regional policies in this regard. It is critical to build India's growth momentum on the basis of its natural endowments, he added.

WTT Star Contender Goa 2024 to take place in January

The second edition of India's biggest table tennis tournament, the WTT Star Contender will be held in Goa from January 23 to 28 next year. World Table Tennis (WTT), conceptualised by the International Table Tennis Federation in 2019, serves as the epicentre for professional men's and women's table tennis events globally. The series encompasses a multitude of events throughout the year, with the four Grand Smashes standing out as the highest-ranked tournaments. The tournament is a part of the

six-star Contender series events where only the top-30 players are eligible to participate, with six players compulsory from the top 20 in the world rankings. The tournament boasts of a prize pool of USD 250,000 and ranking points will be up for grabs. The event is also a qualifier for the WTT Cup Finals and WTT Champions Series. "Playing against world-class players or watching them from close quarters always inspires the younger generation. This tournament is a great opportunity for our Indian players," Table Tennis Federation of India (TTFI) secretary-general Kamlesh Mehta said in a release. The first edition of the WTT



Star Contender Goa took place earlier this year and had some of the world's biggest stars on show, including world No. 1 Fan Zhendong, Japanese prodigy Tomokazu Harimoto, world No. 4 Wang Yidi, and World No. 5 Hina Hayata. Besides, the tournament also saw the participation of 40 Indian players, which was the highest for a WTT event. China's Liang Jingkun and Yidi had won the men's and women's singles titles respectively in the inaugural edition of the tournament. The tournament will be co-hosted by Stupa Sports Analytics and Ultimate Table Tennis under the guidance of TTFI.



South Korea athletes pushed to attend navy boot camp

South Korea's Olympic committee is pushing to send hundreds of athletes to a military training centre to enhance their mental toughness for the Paris Olympics, a move that's been criticized as outdated and regressive. The Korean Sport & Olympic Committee advised domestic associations last week to send athletes to the Korea Marine Corps camp in the southeastern port city of Pohang for three days of training this month, according to some associations. About 320 athletes, including women, are expected at the boot camp, committee officials said on Thursday. Sports associations have previously asked their athletes to take marine-style training ahead of big sports events, but it's the first time the Olympic committee has recommended it, committee officials added. Those officials reportedly decided on the camp following the Asian Games in China in October, when South Korea finished third in the gold medal count to China and Japan. After the Asian Games, Olympic committee head Lee Kee-Heung floated the idea of marine camp training and said athletes would be joined by top committee officials including himself, according to South Korean media reports. Messages slamming and deriding the Olympic committee plan flooded South Korean social media and internet sites. "Are we still under the period of military rules?" read a message on X, formerly known as

Twitter. Another X user said "They can just select marines with strong mental power as Olympic athletes," while others called the Olympic committee's plan "a comedy" or "out of mind." Details of the December 18-20 camp in Pohang are still under discussion between the Olympic committee and the Korea Marine Corps. But, previous pre-Olympic marine camp training involving fencers, wrestlers and handballers included rappelling courses, and carrying 140-kilogram (310-pound) inflatable boats on their heads together. Reached by The Associated Press, South Korea's wrestling and breakdancing associations said they won't send their athletes to the marine camp because they have competitions when the training is scheduled. Yukyoum Kim, a physical education professor at Seoul National University, said athletes can still learn something from marine training. The programs were developed not only by marine officers but also by sports management and medicine professionals, Kim added. "It is crucial to help the athletes overcome small and big hardships for their personal and teams' growths," Kim said. "Although it has involved forceful group camps and violence in the past, marine boot camp has played a rather effective role to achieve those goals." Big companies and schools have also sent employees and students to the marine camp and other military-run training.



Simone has Inter aiming for a Serie A title

His playing career was overshadowed by the exploits of his big brother. His coaching career has hitherto been marked by near misses. Now - finally - Simone Inzaghi appears destined to have his moment in the spotlight. Approaching the midpoint of Serie A, Inzaghi's Inter Milan leads the league and is the favourite to win the title. After routing city rival AC Milan 5-1 in the derby in September, Inter drew at second-placed Juventus and put on a convincing performance in a 3-0 victory at defending champion Napoli in successive matches over the last two weeks. "It was a show of force," Inzaghi said after the win at Stadio Diego Armando Maradona. "But, we have a lot of work ahead, and we're going to approach it in the same manner that we did over these last three-and-a-half months." While Inzaghi played on the star-studded Lazio team that won Serie A in 2000, it was Filippo "Superpippo" Inzaghi who gained the bigger headlines by helping Juventus and Milan to a series of domestic and European titles and Italy to the 2006 World Cup trophy. Now, Filippo is on the other end of Serie A, having recently been hired to coach last-placed Salernitana. The brothers are scheduled to meet in February. While Simone had a successful start to his coaching career at Lazio by winning an Italian Cup and a couple of Italian Super Cups with the Roman club, he was thrust into a difficult position at Inter when Antonio Conte left unexpectedly after guiding the Nerazzurri to the 2021 Serie A title. In his first season, Inzaghi's Inter finished two points behind Serie A champion AC

Milan after a season-long duel. Then, last season, Inter beat Milan in the Champions League semi-finals before falling to Pep Guardiola's Manchester City, albeit by a narrow margin in the final. Now, all of a sudden, Inzaghi is being compared to Inter's most successful coaches - Helenio Herrera, Giovanni Trapattoni, Roberto Mancini, Jose Mourinho and Conte - even though his biggest achievements with the Nerazzurri remain two Italian Cups and two Italian Super Cups. The reasons behind the praise are not just the results. It's also about Inter's attacking style and flair with Inzaghi's preferred 3-5-2 formation, which has produced the most goals (33) in Serie A and the least goals conceded (7). Lautaro Martinez leads the league with 13 goals; Marcus Thuram has added a new dimension after replacing the departed Romelu Lukaku as Martinez's strike partner; Nicolò Barella has been a force in midfield; the defence hasn't missed a beat despite injuries; and goalkeeper Yann Sommer has made Inter fans quickly forget Andre Onana's move to Manchester United. "It's still early and anything can happen - there are so many matches this time of the year that you could have two or three injuries and it could turn everything around instantly - but Inter is a squad that plays physical, technical and rational football," said Italy coach Luciano Spalletti, who guided Napoli to the title last season and previously was in charge at Inter. Up next for Inter is Udinese on Saturday. Then, Real Sociedad visits the San Siro on Tuesday in a game that will decide which team wins their Champions League group. Both sides have already secured passage to the knockout stages.

Two rising stars of Bundesliga meet

Is Bayer Leverkusen's German title challenge for real? How about Stuttgart's chances? The Bundesliga's two teams on the rise meet on Sunday when league-leading Leverkusen travels to third-placed Stuttgart. Leverkusen's 21-game unbeaten start to the season is on the line again after a rare moment of vulnerability in a 1-1 draw with Borussia Dortmund on Sunday. Stuttgart knocked Dortmund out of the German Cup on Wednesday and is aiming for another upset win in a season already packed with eye-catching performances. The simple fact that Stuttgart vs. Leverkusen has become a must-watch game in Germany is a tribute to Leverkusen coach Xabi Alonso and his Stuttgart counterpart Sebastian Hoernes, who both took over relegation-threatened teams partway through last season and turned them around. Leverkusen may have to do without Florian Wirtz after the 20-year-old attacking midfielder limped off after a hard tackle to the ankle in Wednesday's 3-1 cup win over second-division Paderborn. Leverkusen's and Stuttgart's rise has displaced two of



Bayern Munich's usual challengers. Dortmund hosts Leipzig on Saturday with both teams having something to prove. The top task for Dortmund and coach Edin Terzic is to bridge the gulf between its European successes and its domestic failures. Dortmund qualified for the Champions League knockout stages with a game to spare - and from arguably the most difficult group too - but its recent form in Germany is dismal.

A lopsided 4-0 loss to Bayern last month was the obvious low point, but Terzic's team has just five points from its last five league games and its defence struggled to track Stuttgart players' runs in the cup loss on Wednesday. Leipzig is fourth, a place above Dortmund, but consistency is the main problem for a young team which has had some statement games this season - including a win and a draw with Bayern - but plenty of underwhelming moments,

Reserve goalie Tenas grabs the spotlight

Criticised for recent glaring errors at Paris Saint-Germain, Italy goalkeeper Gianluigi Donnarumma did not help his case with his awful tackle last weekend. The reckless move gave younger rival Arnau Tenas the chance to show off his class. And the Spanish goalie seized the moment. When Donnarumma was sent off after only nine minutes, Tenas came off the bench and made his debut in the French league. Seemingly immune to pressure, Tenas made seven decisive saves to deliver a clean sheet, and 10-man PSG won at Le Havre 2-0. Tenas, who joined as a free agent over the summer from Barcelona, will have another chance to prove himself this weekend, this time in front of his home crowd when PSG hosts Nantes on Saturday. Following the red card he

received at Le Havre, Donnarumma is suspended. Another backup, Keylor Navas, is out injured. Ligue 1 front-runner PSG has a four-point lead over Nice, which plays Reims on Sunday. Third-placed Monaco travels to Rennes on Saturday. Donnarumma was sent off when he came out of the area and tried to clear a long ball with a very high tackle. Instead, he made contact the face of Le Havre forward Josue Casimir. Donnarumma's first red card since joining PSG in 2021 did not have much impact on PSG's result, again, but was another dent in his credibility. He was at fault last month in a 1-1 draw against Newcastle in the Champions League. That night, he gifted Newcastle the opener when he only pushed a weak shot straight to Alexander Isak for an easy finish. A controversial penalty in the eighth minute of stoppage time ultimately salvaged a point for PSG



but did not spare Donnarumma from criticism. The error on Isak's goal marked the second time in days that the Italian goalie was under scrutiny for a mistake after conceding a goal against Monaco in Ligue 1. PSG coach Luis Enrique defended the 24-year-old Donnarumma after he was

sent off, and instead blamed his team's defensive line and his own guidelines. "I always ask the goalkeeper to cover the area, it was my mistake," Enrique said. "The ball came an easy way to catch. The defenders were distracted, they could not catch it, and a forward attacked us. Gigio just did

what I always ask him to do." Enrique has been closely following 22-year-old Tenas, who was the Spain goalkeeper when the team won the Under-19 European Championship in 2019. Last year, Tenas was called up to the senior Spain squad when Enrique was in charge.

Although he made a point of defending Donnarumma last weekend, Enrique was also full of praise for Tenas. "He trains every day as if it was the last training of his life," the coach said. "When you need him, you know he'll be there." Despite Tenas' starring debut and Donnarumma's struggles, it's unlikely Enrique will bench Donnarumma for next week's decisive Champions League match against group leader Borussia Dortmund in Germany. Gianluigi Buffon, a former Italy and PSG keeper, said Donnarumma was strong enough mentally to weather the criticism and bounce back. "He's got great armour when it comes to criticism and questioning himself," Buffon said. "When you're considered to be one of the three best goalkeepers in the world, it's only natural that every mistake should give rise to this kind of controversy."

Lifter Bindyarani fails to complete her event

Ajith finishes 2nd in 73kg Group C at Grand Prix II

Commonwealth Games silver medallist Bindyarani Devi put up a disappointing performance at the IWF Grand Prix II as she could not get an overall total in women's 55kg after failing to lift the weight in any of her three attempts in clean and jerk section. Bindyarani was one of only two athletes in the 12-lifter field who did not finish (DNF) her event here on Wednesday night. The 24-year-old could manage only two legal lifts in six attempts, both coming in the snatch section, where she logged a best effort of 81kg. Bindyarani, who won a silver medal at the Asian



Championships earlier this year in May, failed to lift 106kg in her first attempt in clean and jerk, followed by two more attempts to pick up 109kg. While her first attempt was deemed a no lift due to bending and extending of arms, the

Manipuri simply couldn't keep the barbell over her head in the following two attempts. Her personal best in clean and jerk is 116kg, which she had lifted in Birmingham during the CWG last year. Reigning national champion

Narayan Ajith put up an underwhelming display to sign off in the second spot in Group C of the men's 73kg event, which is an Olympic weight category. The Commonwealth Championships gold medallist lifted 133kg in snatch and 157kg in the clean and jerk section for a total effort of 290kg, which is a whopping 22kg less than the 312kg he lifted at the World Championships in September. The final standings will be drafted after the completing of Group A proceedings. Commonwealth Games champion Achinta Sheuli is also in the fray in the 73kg event. The Kolkata lifter has been placed in Group B based on his entry weight.

One of the most exciting seasons of the Brazilian league ended with the most stable team of the season defending its title and the club that was home to the late Pelé relegated for the first time. Palmeiras drew 1-1 at Cruzeiro on Wednesday to be crowned Brazilian champion for the 12th time. The 18-year-old Endrick scored his 11th goal of the season to give Palmeiras an early lead and Nikao equalized in the 80th minute at the Mineirao Stadium in Belo Horizonte. Santos' relegation following a 2-1 home loss to Fortaleza was

another setback for the club at the stadium where Pelé's funeral took place in January. This year's title went to Palmeiras with striker Endrick, set to join Real Madrid, scoring several key goals and rival Botafogo squandering a 13-point lead in the standings. Atlético Mineiro and Flamengo, which had slim chances of winning the trophy in the last round, lost their matches. Those defeats allowed Luis Suárez' Gremio to finish runner-up after a 3-2 win at Fluminense, with the Uruguayan striker scoring two goals. Palmeiras finished with 70 points, two more than



Gremio. Botafogo, which led for 31 of 38 rounds, finished in fifth with 64 points. The Rio club lost 3-1 at Internacional, and ended the

season with an 11-game winless streak. Santos finished with 43 points, one behind Bahia, which beat Atletico Mineiro 4-1, and two less than Vasco da Gama, the winners of another tense clash against Bragantino. Mario Sergio opened the scoring for the visitors in the 39th minute. Messias equalized in the 58th minute to give Santos hope it could put Vasco da Gama or Bahia in a relegation position. But Fortaleza's Juan Martin Lucero scored from long distance shortly before the final whistle. The match was ended as soon as Santos fans tried to invade the pitch, forcing players to run to the locker rooms.

This is not the first time Gambhir has been involved in an on field altercation. He has had fiery exchanges with Virat Kohli a couple of times during the IPL, including earlier this year when Royal Challengers Bangalore took on Lucknow Super Giants.

Steve Smith will not follow his teammate David Warner into Test retirement as the former Australian captain thinks he can still achieve a lot more, clarified Warren Craig, his long-time manager.

Warner had expressed his desire for a Sydney farewell after the third and final Test against Pakistan starting from January 3, 2024.

There have been talks about Smith following the suit after a below par season this year against India and England. While the New South Welshman's overall average remains the best among contemporary batsmen -- 9320 runs from 102 Tests at an average of 58.61 with 32 hundreds -- he has struggled for big runs this season.

However, Craig did not buy into the floating rumours. "I can debunk that (retirement) at this point in time. He's still talking about things he wants to achieve," Craig was quoted as saying by Sydney Morning Herald.

The 34-year-old top-order batter has achieved every trophy during his illustrious career, including the Ashes (thrice), ODI World Cup (2015 and 2023), T20 World Cup (2021) and the World Test Championship (2023).

But this year, he has man-

aged only 518 runs across 17 innings at an average of 34.53. But standing very close to becoming the fourth Australian batter to score 10000 Test runs, Smith might not want to miss that chance. Allan Border, Ricky Ponting and Steve Waugh are the Aussie players to have crossed that landmark. Smith was also in decent form during the recently concluded ODI World Cup in India, scoring 302 runs from 10 innings at an average of 33.55 with two fifties. However, former Australian captain Mark Taylor offered a word of caution to Smith. "It doesn't mean they're done (in mid 30s), but normally you've seen their best by then. The early-30s would be the purple patch for most players," he told SMH.

England skipper Jos Buttler said he was "fed up" with his woeful run of form and that it was time to get back to being "the player that I know I am" by putting up a solid performance with the bat. The wicketkeeper batter, who struggled with the bat all throughout the ODI World Cup, scored his first half-century since September -- an unbeaten 58 off 45 balls to guide England to a series-leveling six-wicket victory over hosts West Indies in the second ODI here on Wednesday. "I've been searching for form,

have had moments where it has been frustrating," Buttler was quoted as saying by the 'BBC'. "I was getting fed up with it so it was time to put in a performance and get back to the player that I know I am," he added. Ahead of the second ODI Buttler had been dismissed for five single digit scores in eight outings. But the match-winning knock on Wednesday made him the fifth England batter to cross the 5,000-run mark in ODIs. "Really pleasing. I've been playing for a while now so it's great when you get to those milestones after playing for a long period of time. It's been a frustrating time recently". Buttler had taken over the reins as white-ball skipper from World Cup-winning captain Eoin Morgan last year. Under his leadership, England won the T20 World Cup last year. However, defending champions England made an embarrassing early exit from the ODI World Cup last month, finishing seventh to just qualify for the 2025 Champions Trophy.

Young off-spinner Shreyanka Patil feels India should have varied the pace more while bowling and also fielded better in their 38-run defeat against England in the opening Women's T20I here.

Renuka Singh Thakur (3/27) got two wickets in the first over, but India squandered the advantage to help England post a massive 197 for 6 on Wednesday. The home team batters then cut a sorry figure on a placid wicket to be restricted to 159 for 6 in the opening T20I of the three-match series.

"We could have varied the pace a little more, the wicket was not that great for bowlers, it was completely in favour of the batters. I could bowled better but bowling in the death overs is not at all easy," Patil (2/44) told reporters at the Wankhede Stadium.



Patil, who made her T20 debut on Wednesday, admitted that the fielding was one area in which the Indian team needs immediate attention as it looks to bounce back in the second match to be played at the same venue on Saturday.

"The wicket was amazing to bat on, it was not easy (to bowl), but I think we did a pretty decent job. We will have a discussion as to what can be improved. Fielding could have been better, but we will bounce back stronger," she said.

The 21-year-old said it was difficult for her to get sleep after

knowing that she would make her debut against England. "I was very happy that I got the cap. I was a bit excited as well as nervous, I did not get any sleep (the previous night) but after one or two balls I was fine. (It felt like) I belong here," she said. Patil said the inaugural Women's Premier League has helped her learn the tricks of playing under lights with the white ball. "It (WPL) did help me personally playing against Harry die (Harmanpreet Kaur), Smriti Mandhana, Jemimah (Rodrigues)," she said. "I think that was the start for me and to carry the momentum here was a good achievement. It did help me to adjust under lights, bowling under pressure... Now I feel like this is where I belong and I am enjoying it." Patil said she did scenario-based practice before the series in Bengaluru which proved beneficial for her.
