FM unveils income tax relief, small saving sops a year before elections

Highlights of Budget 2023-24

Following are the highlights of the Budget 2023-24 tabled in Parliament on Wednesday:

Per capita income has more than doubled to Rs 1.97 lakh in around 9 years

Indian economy has increased in size from being 10th to 5th largest in the world in the past nine years

New Infrastructure Finance Secretariat established to enhance opportunities for pvt investment in infrastructure

The maximum deposit limit for Senior Citizen Savings Scheme to be enhanced from Rs 15 lakh to Rs 30 lakh.

Fiscal Deficit targeted to be below 4.5% by 2025-26.

Investment of Rs 75,000 cr, including Rs 15,000 cr from pvt sources, for 100 critical transport infrastructure projects, for last and first mile connectivity for ports, coal, steel, fertilizer, and food grains sectors.

Outlay for PM Awas Yojana is being enhanced by 66% to over Rs 79,000 crore.

Capital outlay of Rs 2.40 lakh crore has been provided for the Railways, which is the highest ever and about nine times the outlay made in 2013-14.

PAN will be used as the common identifier for all digital systems of specified government agencies to bring in Ease of Doing Business.

30 Skill India International Centres to be set up across different states to skill youth for international opportunities.

Revamped credit guarantee scheme for MSMEs to take effect from 1st April 2023 through infusion of Rs 9,000 crore in the corpus. This scheme would enable additional collateral-free guaranteed credit of Rs 2 lakh crore and also reduce the cost of the credit by about 1 per cent.

The budget adopts following seven priorities -- 'Saptarishi': Development, reaching the last mile, infrastructure and investment, unleashing the potential, green growth, youth power and financial sector

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Wednesday raised the personal income tax rebate limit, doled out sops on small savings and announced one of the biggest hikes in capital spending in the past decade as she did a tight rope walk in the Budget between staying fiscally prudent and meeting public expectations in the year before general elections.

The personal income tax rebate limit has been increased to Rs 7 lakh from the fiscal year starting April 1 under the new tax regime from the previous Rs 5 lakh. Tax slabs has been cut to five from seven earlier. Also, the maximum income tax rate has been reduced to about 39% from 42.7% after a reduction in the highest surcharge to 25% from 37%.

Union Budget drives digital agenda

NEW DELHI: Three centres of excellence for artificial intelligence in top educational institutions and 100 labs in engineering institutions for developing applications using 5G services will be set up, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced on Wednesday. The finance minister made the announcement in her budget speech in Lok Sabha. "Three centres of excellence for artificial intelligence will be set up in top educational institutions. Leading

industry players will partner in conducting interdisciplinary research, developing cutting edge applications and scalable problem solutions in the areas of agriculture, health, sustainable cities," she said. Sitharaman said that a

total of 100 labs will be set up in engineering institutions in collaboration with various authorities, regulators, banks and other business for developing applications using 5G services.

HYDERABAD: The Indian Institute of Millet Research here will soon get a facelift as Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Wednesday announced that it will be supported as 'Centre of Excellence' for sharing best practices, research and technologies at the international level. In her Union Budget speech, she noted that India is the largest producer and second largest exporter of Shree Anna (millets) in the world, which has numerous health benefits and also an integral part of food for centuries. "Now to make India a global hub for 'Shree Anna', the Indian Institute of Millet Research, Hyderabad will be supported as the Centre of Excellence for sharing best practices, research and technologies at the international level," she said. Reacting to the proposal, Krishna Ella, Founder and Executive Chairman, Bharat Biotech International Ltd in a statement said the upgradation of the Millet Research Institute is a clear indication of the government's commitment to rural development and food security.

Sensex jumps over 1,200 points

MUMBAI: Benchmark BSE Sensex zoomed over 1,200 points in the afternoon trade on Wednesday as market investors cheered the Union budget proposals presented by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in the Lok Sabha. The 30-share BSE barometer zoomed 1,223.54 points or 2 per cent to its intra-day high of 60,773.44.

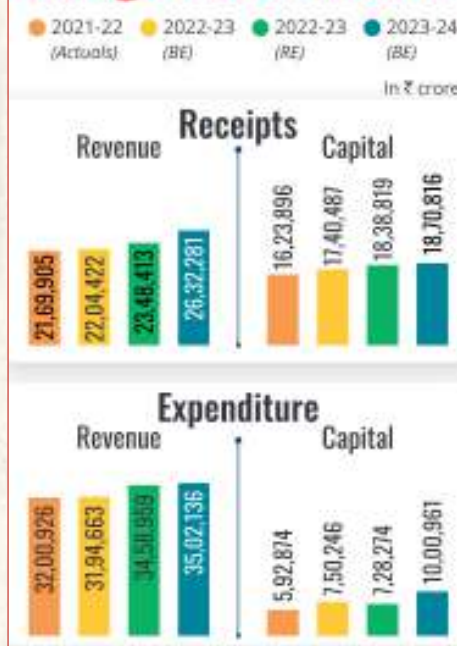

Adani group calls off FPO, money to be returned to investors

BENGALURU: As it's stocks plunged with flagship Adani Enterprises dropped by 28%, Adani Group late Wednesday night decided to call off its 20,000 crore Follow on Public Offer (FPO) in a rare move amidst the growing impact of the Hindenburg report raising allegations of "stock manipulation and accounting fraud." The company in a statement issued said that it will return money to its investors. It said that the decision to cancel the offer was taken in the interests of its subscribers. Gautam Adani, Chairman, Adani Enterprises said that the decision was taken amid the fluctuations the group's stocks saw during the day's trading. Billionaire Gautam Adani lost his title as Asia's richest person on Wednesday as his conglomerate plunged again in the wake of a US short-seller report.

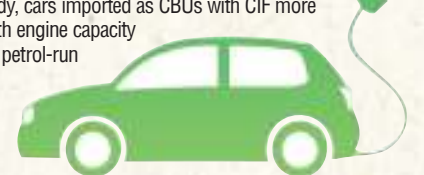

Taxes comprise 58 paise of every rupee

NEW DELHI: For every rupee in the government coffer, 58 paise will come from direct and indirect taxes, 34 paise from borrowings and other liabilities, 6 paise from non-tax revenue like disinvestment and 2 paise from non-debt capital receipts, according to the Budget documents for 2023-24. Goods and Services Tax (GST) will contribute 17 paise in every rupee of revenue, while corporation tax will account for 15 paise. The government is also looking to earn 7 paise out of every rupee from excise duty and 4 paise from customs duty. Income tax will yield 15 paise. The collection from 'borrowings and other liabilities' will be 34 paise, according to the Budget 2023-24.

Fully imported cars, EVs, to cost more

NEW DELHI: Fully imported cars, including electric vehicles will cost more with Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announcing hike in customs duty. Customs duty on vehicles in completely built units (CBUs) costing less than USD 40,000 or with engine capacity less than 3,000 cc for petrol-run vehicles and less than 2,500 cc for diesel-run vehicles has been raised from 60 per cent to 70%. Similarly, customs duty on electrically operated vehicles in CBU form, other than with cost, insurance and freight (CIF) value of more than USD 40,000, has also been raised to 70% from 60%. The Budget also outlined that customs duty on vehicles, including electric vehicles, in semi-knocked down (SKD) form will rise to 35% from 30% earlier. Already, cars imported as CBUs with CIF more than USD 40,000 or with engine capacity more than 3,000 cc for petrol-run vehicles and more than 2,500 cc for diesel-run vehicles attract 100% customs duty.

T'gana draws a blank

Once again, it has been a disappointing budget for Telangana as a state. Although the state government had put out a wish list in keeping with federal norms, none of its proposals and suggestions was addressed in the Union Budget. Most importantly, there was no mention of the promises made under the AP Reorganisation Act. The ninth

budget is no different, as Telangana, like in the previous eight Union Budgets introduced by the BJP-led Union government, did not receive sufficient funds. There is no word about the railway coach factory that Telangana has been asking for nine years. The funds given to the tribal university are bare minimum. Kaleshwaram has not been given status of a national project. Telangana was supposed to get Rs 1,350 crore as a fund for backward areas as included in the Reorganisation Act. Telangana

did not get anything in the current budget, but Rs 5,300 crore has been allocated for the development of drought and backward areas in poll-bound Karnataka. The Centre had offered to increase the FRMB limit to raise loans for states by 0.5 per cent of GSDP if states install meters for agriculture pump sets in five years from 2020-21 to 2024-25. Telangana has been against implementing some of the power reforms, including installation of meters on farm pump sets.

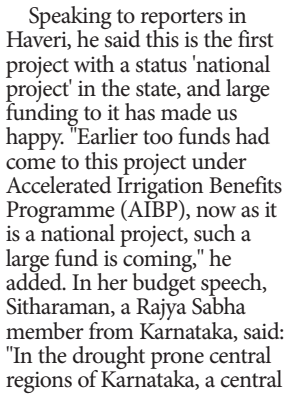

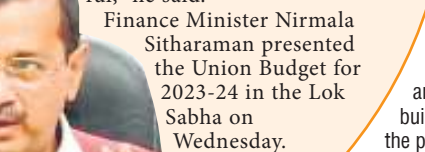

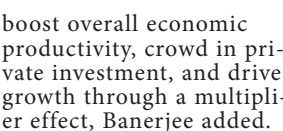

REDUCED OUTLAY FOR EDUCATION

Experts pin hopes on State Budget

The Budget for education sector decreased to 6.25 per cent for 2022-2023 as against 6.69 per cent in 2020-21 and 6.7 per cent in 2021-22. Experts consisting of teachers, principals and edtech founders pin point conditions of schools and welcomed the other initiatives.

One of the experienced teachers said the progress of a system mainly depends on how much priority governments give to the education and health sectors. All the experts know how important these fields are in Telangana and Union must acknowledge to distribute funds to this sector, he added.

The experts look up to State for more funds to the education sector in the budget that will be introduced soon and provides all facilities to the government schools.

Many parents have enrolled their children in government schools due to financial difficulties. Government figures

show that the enrollment of students in government schools has increased. "In order to retain the increased enrollment, we request that more funds be allocated to the government education sector, which is suffering from the lack of minimum facilities, on a war footing and appropriate steps should be taken to increase the confidence of the people and parents towards the government schools."

Gusti Noria, President, the Hyderabad Public School Society said, "This is overall a good consolidated budget. It is a good step by the FM to increase allocation for school education by 8 per cent i.e. from Rs 63,449 crore (budget estimate) in 2022-23 to Rs 68,804 crore in 2023-24. The emphasis on establishing CoEs for artificial intelligence and also teachers' training being revisited for better pedagogy and raising quality education, is a welcome step. The establishment of District Training Centres for educators along with the National Digital



Library is yet another initiative that will be a boost for both public and private school education. The Skill India International Centres that are going to be set up across states will provide the right digital ecosystem for skilling and help foster national apprenticeship.

They applauded the initiative of the Centre to recruit 38,800 teachers and support staff for the 740 Eklavya Model Residential Schools that will end up serving 3.5 lakh tribal students. Together, these steps would surely pave an effective path to implement the National

Education Policy for the Amrit Peedhi.

Karun Tadepalli, Founder and CEO, byteXL, said, "The education sector has witnessed some of the announcements from a longer-term perspective. The increase of 8 per cent allocation to higher education to Rs 44,094 crore is a welcome move from the point of raising the employability quotient of students. This will be a key component in transforming the institutes to provide better education compatible with industry needs. New age courses for industry, 4.0 like coding,

AI, robotics, mechatronics, IOT, 3D printing, drones, and soft skills under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana; 4.0 % will help in skilling the students for global job opportunities making them career-ready. Establishing a National Digital Library will enhance the culture of eLearning across the country, which will be a positive step towards a futuristic approach."

Sumet Mehta, Cofounder of LEAD, School Edtech company said "The first Amrit Kaal Budget's focus on quality of education for all is progressive and encouraging. I welcome the focus on teacher training and upskilling students with Industry 4.0 skills. However, while initiatives such as a National Digital Library and support for Eklavya Model Residential Schools are steps in the right direction to address the massive learning loss from the pandemic, well-designed PPPs are the need of the hour to create innovation at scale for millions of school going students in India."

CENTRE TO SUPPORT HYD'S IIMR

Budget to address gap between youth & industry

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitaraman on Wednesday said that the Centre will support the Indian Institute of Millet Research (IIMR) in Hyderabad as a Centre of Excellence.

The IIMR is an off-shoot of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research which emphasises on research on millets. The core areas of research include pathology, research and value addition of millets across India.

As per the Union government, a Center of Excellence is an organisation emphasising on enhancing research, training and skill training for specific fields. The CoE collaborates with various organisations to understand the labour requirements and provide training accordingly.

Reacting to the Union budget, President of The Federation of Telangana



Chambers Of Commerce and Industry (FTCCI) Anil Agarwal said, "The budget emphasises on seven pillars namely inclusive development, last-mile connectivity, infrastructure and investment and unleashing potential.

The Budget will also address the gap between youth and the industry requirements through skill development programme. The government will set up 30 international skill centres across states." "The exemption of tax for those who earn up

to Rs 7 lakh annually is a substantial take away from this year's Budget," he added. Sharing his insights on the Budget, Chairman of GST and Customs Committee of FTCCI, Sudheer VS said, "This budget is favourable to everyone. It will benefit the salaried employees, government employees or the MSMEs. It is truly an inclusive budget."

"When it comes to the business community, there is a product incentive scheme if the Budget would have taken it into consideration; the budget would have been a complete package. The emphasis has been laid on skilling and education," he added.

"Green energy is another area that the Budget focuses on, most of our money that is goes into foreign exchange is used for purchasing fuel, to curb the flow the Centre is looking for alternatives such as hydro and bio fuels.

Hyderabad among 1,275 more stations to be redeveloped

Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnav said that the long-pending investment with which Railways potential will reach its targets in the current year.

The railways has been allocated Rs 2.40 lakh crore. "This will be the medium to crores of passengers as we contribute to various revenues of tourism. The selected railway stations will be upgraded as they are core part of passengers. As part of this, Undee Amrit Bharat station and 1,275 more stations will be redeveloped. has world-class amenities has become the topic of the year 2022 and this train will also be hauled at three more places.

Speaking about another development for Railways, the Minister said that Hydrogen Train, part of Green growth will be launched by December 2023.

Later, addressing media, General Manager Anil Kumar, South Central Railway, said

that there is not yet any detail table on the allocation for Telangana, but more share is expected this year. Another announcement was made that Bharat Gaurav is that trains will begin from South Central Railway. The date is March 18 and they are known as Punyakshetra Yatra and they will be passing from Kashi and Puri. These will start from Secunderabad.

TSRTC special discounts for advance quota

Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TSRTC) has announced special discounts for travellers who make advance reservations. The corporation said 5 per cent discount on the ticket if the reservation is made 31 days to 45 days in advance and 10 per cent discount if the ticket is booked 46 days to 60 days in advance.

The Online Passenger Reservation System (OPRS) software has been updated accordingly. TSRTC has clarified that this discount is applicable for all services with advance reservation facility.

On the occasion of Sankranti festival, the company has increased the advance reservation from 30 days to 60 days. This facility is being provided till June this year and has received good response from the passengers. They booked their tickets online without any hassle. TSRTC has announced these special concessions to be more accessible to passengers.

T-Hub CEO terms budget 'extremely encouraging'

We are also happy to note that the government had allocated Rs 283.5 crore for the Startup India Seed Fund Scheme and

the budgetary allocations for the Fund of Funds for Start-ups stood at Rs 1,000 crore. This will help in nurturing innovation and encouraging private investments in the start-up ecosystem", MSR said.

The government has taken a series of steps to promote start-ups in the country. The Budget highlights special incentives under the Startup India initiative, Fund of Funds for Start-ups (FFS) scheme, Startup India Seed Fund Scheme (SISFS), and Credit Guarantee Scheme for Start-ups (CGSS) encouraging capital at various stages of the business cycle of start-ups.

Mass cheating during TOEFL tests detected

Hyderabad cybercrime police has registered a case against a gang for accommodating mass copying in TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) exam room through Whatsapp, on Wednesday.

Police revealed that the gang has been charging Rs 25,000 from TOEFL applicants to leak answers to them and score high in the exam. The gang has been leaking answers through Whatsapp to students in the exam centers.

ETS (Educational Testing Service India) registered a complaint against the incident with evidence. Investigations are underway.

TOEFL is conducted as a qualifying exam for international universities. Amidst trends of International education, many students have been taking Qualifying English and foreign language exams to apply for international universities.

Singareni CCL transports 68.4 lakh tonnes of coal

The Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) recorded an all-time high coal shipment in January by transporting 68.4 lakh tonnes of coal in January. The SCCL also recorded 16.67 lakh cubic meters overburden (OB) extraction on January 31, which is another all-time record according to the management.

SCCL Chairman and MD N. Sridhar said, "In the month of January, Singareni transported 68.4 lakh tonnes of coal, an all-time record in its history. The previous record of 64.7 lakh tonnes of coal shipment in the month of March 2016 was recorded till now."

He further added, "I am happy for achieving many all-time records in the background of progressing towards the specified targets in the month of January. I hope that if the same trend continues in the remaining 60 days, if all the areas go ahead in a planned manner to achieve the targets assigned to them on a daily basis, they will be able to cross

the specified annual production target of 700 lakh tonnes."

In January, a total of 1,216 pallets of coal were transported from 11 areas at an average rate of 39 railcars per day, surpassing the highest coal shipment of 1,186 pallets in December 2022. Majority of the coal was transported to thermal power stations in Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh along with Telangana GenCo."

Along with coal transportation, Singareni has also achieved a new record in the removal of overburden in open cast mines.

On January 31, from the morning shift to the night shift, the highest overburden of 16.67 lakh cubic meters was removed. On January 15, OB of 15.75 lakh cubic meters was removed.

The overburden is crucial to produce coal in 18 surface mines across Singareni. It is removed with the help of company machines and off-loading machines. This new record was set when 14.83 lakh cubic meters of overburden was cleared.

Govt schools under Mana Ooru Mana Badi opened

The first phase of inauguration of schools under Mana Ooru Mana Badi has rolled out in the state.

State Education Minister Sabitha Indra Reddy said that the government's aim is to strengthen the education system.

On Wednesday, Sabitha Indra Reddy, Chief Secretary to Government Shanti Kumari, ZP Chairperson Thigala Anita Haranath Reddy and Education Department Secretary Vakati Karuna inaugurated the infrastructure facilities established under the Mana Ooru-Mana Badi programme at Mandal Parishad Primary School in Rachaluru Village, Kandukur Mandal, Ranga Reddy district.

On this occasion, the Minister said that the Mana Ooru Mana Badi programme was undertaken by Chief Minister for the development of education and with the intention of providing 26,000 schools in the state, 9,000 schools were selected in the first release, and as part of that, 464 schools in Rangareddy district were provided with all facilities and this is historic.

2,814 child labourers rescued through Operation Smile-IX

In an initiative to rescue child labourers and missing children, a total of 2,814 children have been rescued under Operation Smile- IX, conducted by the Child Welfare Committee throughout Telangana from January 1 to January 31. Over 450 of them were rescued in five zones of Hyderabad. Among the rescued children, 2,421 were boys and 393 were girls. Around 2,467 children have been returned to their parents. Remaining 347 children were admitted to rescue homes and child care homes.

According to the police, 872 children, who belong to neighbouring states or countries, have been rescued. The report revealed that 161 children were rescued from streets,

1,401 children were rescued from bonded child labour; 203 children from brick kilns, 930 children from other industrial sites and 119 children who were begging, were rescued in the operation.

Around 352 children were enrolled in DARPAN Application and 802 children were compared with the missing children database during Operation Smile-IX. In total, 391 FIRs were registered under various sections of laws and involving 403 accused persons. Out of them, 390 accused persons were arrested on the same day. The mission also rescued a child who had been missing for the last six years in Nalgonda.

The Labour Department has also imposed a fine of Rs 21,54,371, collectively, on the employers for working with

child labourers. A total of six cases have been registered in different police stations against employers for putting children at work.

Specific daily situation reports for collecting data were framed and such collated data was further used to know potential "Black Spots" where most of the children were found under vulnerable conditions.

During this operation, a total of 2,814 children were rescued. Out of them, 760 children were rescued by Cyberabad police teams.

Operation Smile is conducted every year in the month of January to trace and rescue missing children, children involved in child labour, bonded labour, micro industries, begging and trafficking children.

Gang of four arrested for cheating; Rs 72 lakh seized

The Commissioner's Task Force in coordination with the Nampally police on Wednesday arrested four persons in connection with cheating.

The four accused were identified as 30-year-old carpenter Kanhaiah Lal AKA Jatin, 24-year-old Ramavathar Sharma AKA Muniram, 26-year-old, Bharat Kumar and 25-year-old Ram Kishan Sharma. All the accused are natives of Rajasthan.

The gang has been booked under two cases of cheating by the Nampally police under Section 420 of the Indian Penal Code. The police seized cash worth Rs 72, 50,000 from the accused. Kanhaiah was involved in sliding window business in Kolkata. He took loans from his acquaintances for business transactions. Kanahiah planned to dupe

people on the pretext of taking loans. He prepared fake currency notes along with Sharma, Kishan and Kumar. Kanhaiah then took loans from his customers in Hyderabad. He handed them fake notes while retuning the amount. On December 24 2022, Kanhaiah and Sharma took a loan of Rs 30, 00,000 from the victim Mohammed Younus, the co-owner of Hotel Majestic. The accused then prepared fake notes worth Rs 30, 00,000 with the help of Kishan and Kumar and handed them to the victim on January 1, 2023.

On December 26, 2022, Kanhaiah and Sharma took a loan of Rs 50, 00,000 from Ikon Technologies Private Limited at Madhapur. The accused promised to return the amount on December 28.

The police arrested the gang from Bhaskar Lodge, in Secunderabad.

Traffic curbs ahead of TS Budget session

The commuters moving from ESI Hospital towards SR Nagar Metro station will be diverted at Ameerpet Metro station, Panjagutta Junction, NIMS and VV Statue.

Traffic moving from CTO Junction towards Paradise will be diverted to Ranigunj and will go through Karbala, Children's Park, Tankbund, Ambedkar Statue, Telugu Talli flyover, Iqbal Minar and Ravindra Bharathi. Similarly, the commuters moving from Plaza Junction towards Patny will be diverted at Bata, Bible House and Karbala.

Amrit Kaal Budget without Amrit Arogya: Health experts

Satish Reddy, Chairman, Dr Reddy's Laboratories, said, "An inclusive Budget from the Finance Minister will boost the critical areas such as education, agriculture, healthcare, environment, digital, start-ups, skilling and others. For pharma, announcements on a new programme to promote research and innovation through Centres of Excellence, collaboration with the ICMR laboratories, encouragement to investment in R&D point helps much-anticipated support for innovation in pharma."

Good Budget

Budget 2023-24 has something for everyone, and yet there has been no fiscal profligacy

There is a term often used for pre-poll budgets, mostly by the Opposition to disparage the government of the day — ‘political budget.’ Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman’s Budget 2023-24 certainly doesn’t fall under this category. One of the biggest political budgets was the one that the Congress-led United Progressive Alliance government made in 2008. It announced a Rs 60,000-crore farm loan waiver, which went up to almost Rs 72,000 crore. The waiver helped the UPA’s return to power next year. There was a strong correlation between the amount spent in states and the UPA’s electoral fortunes in it. Thankfully, Sitharaman has steered clear of the reprehensible populism the UPA exhibited 15 years ago. Yes, she can be accused of trying to placate income-tax payers by giving them relief, but the fact is that it was long overdue. The point to be stressed here is that the biggest beneficiaries are those who are in the lowest brackets. This means more money in the pockets of common people which they will either invest or spend — and thus boost demand and savings, both of which are desirable. Micro, small and medium enterprises have also been extended income-tax benefits. What is conspicuous about personal income-tax cuts is the fact that the people in the highest tax slab have also been given relief. The highest tax rate in our country is 42.74 per cent, which is among the highest in the world. She has proposed to bring this down to 39 per cent.

This is a very courageous step in a country where it is fashionable to slam the rich — and especially when her party is gearing up for the general elections in 2024.

In line with the Narendra Modi Government’s emphasis on infrastructure, the Finance Minister has steeply increased, third time in a row, the capital investment outlay by 33 per cent to Rs 10 lakh crore. This is around 3.3 per cent of the gross domestic product or GDP. This will be almost three times the outlay in 2019-20. She went on to point out that the direct capital investment by the Centre is complemented by the provision made for creation of capital assets through grants-in-aid to states, thus making the ‘effective capital expenditure’ to Rs 13.7 lakh crore. She rightly emphasised upon her Government’s focus on capital expenditure to enhance growth potential, generate jobs, crowd in private investment, and provide a cushion against global headwinds. A good thing about the Budget is that, even though it has something for everyone — from the middle classes to the rich, from MSMEs to big corporations — fiscal prudence has been maintained. While pegging the fiscal deficit for 2023-24 at 5.9 per cent of GDP, she pledged to tread “the path of fiscal consolidation, reaching a fiscal deficit below 4.5 per cent by 2025-26.” The fiscal deficit already came down from 6.7 per cent in 2021-22 to 6.4 per cent in 2022-23 (revised estimates). In a nutshell, Budget 2023-24 is good.

Not in good humour

Rajinikanth’s public notice stopping mimicry artists from mimicking him is rather harsh and uncalled for

Mimicry and stand-up comedy are ‘national’ pastimes of people in the southern states of Tamil Nadu and Kerala. Specialists in mimicry eke out a living caricaturing their favourite film stars and politicians and these programs are the most wanted ones in star-studded stage shows in India and abroad. Earlier there were only one or two comedy artists to mimic film stars and their mannerisms. In South India where film stars are adored like demiGods, their fans go berserk when the comedy artists dish out the mannerisms and style of their superstars. In yesteryears, there were fashion stores and hairdressing saloons named after M G Ramachandran, Shivaji Ganesan, and Jaishankar, the Tamil matinee icons. Not long ago, we had Khushbu Wines in Chennai named after the diva of Tamil films. Many restaurants in Tamil Nadu serve the delicious Khushbu Idly, known for its softness and distinct taste. At no point in time MGR, Shivaji, or Khushbu have questioned the propriety of the persons who ‘misused’ their names and style to entertain people. Last week, the reigning superstar of Tamil films Rajinikanth came out with a public notice he issued through his lawyer declaring that whoever mimics his style and mannerism and makes use of his name for commercial purposes stand to face civil and criminal cases.

The public notice portrays him as an actor with a humongous reputation and he enjoys a celebrity status and has the ‘personality/publicity/celebrity/rights over all facets of his personality’. No one can blame Rajinikanth for questioning the propriety of businessmen and entrepreneurs exploiting his name in commercial ventures. But his decision to say no to poor mimicry artists would rob them of a chance to earn a livelihood and this is certain to cast a shadow over the goodwill enjoyed by the superstar. There was a lot of heart burning when superstar Amitabh Bachchan, music maestro Thyagaraja, and playback singer K J Yesudas demanded that they be paid royalty by performers who make use of their acting and singing talents. The Indian Copyright Act has indeed put restrictions on the wanton misuse of such works by vested interests. But the truth remains that a true artist should not be greedy and ask the wannabe artists for royalties because it would be like robbing from begging bowls. The mimicry artists should show restraint and stay away from spoofing the maestros and superstars. One should not set the house on fire to kill a rat.

Economic reality check on China

China though making strides in the economic field is on a slippery slope. Its economic model exploits countries and is hegemonistic in approach

China has been hogging the bright lime-light for the last two decades, almost since the beginning of the current century for a growing economic powerhouse status and a country destined to overtake the US in economic and geopolitical might. The way it was developing its infrastructure and creating a most cost-competitive global manufacturing base was, to say the least, mind-boggling. But what was being projected and envisaged in 2003 is not being reiterated today, twenty years later. What is the reason?

The last two years have shaken the economic pillars of China. The real estate sector which accounts for nearly 30 percent of the Chinese economy has slipped into deep recessionary doldrums. Evidenced by the collapse of the Evergrande, the real estate business entity stricken by high debts and its serviceability crisis, the overall picture of the country’s economy and its short and medium-term outlook is anything but bright. The writer happened to visit China in 2014 and is privy to scores of high-rise multistoried residential buildings on the outskirts of its IT hub city Cheng Du and all the buildings are vacant-looking like deserted ghost houses.

The situation is, regrettably the same, nay worse, nine years later in 2023. The flats remain unsold in large numbers with the allottee- buyers unable to pay their housing loan installments due to shrinking or unsteady incomes. The writer also saw that at that time, the average cost of goods and services in China was 3 times that of India, which today is more than 4 times. Let me cite a few figures in regard to China’s economy vis- a -vis India. Central Govt. debt (percentage of GDP) is 76.89 for China and 83.4 for India. While the GDP growth rate for China is three percent, for India, it is 6.84. The Debt per capita (in USD) in China is 7164 and for India, it is 1724. The inflation rate (percent) for China is 2 per cent and for India, it is 6.89.

The above is 2022 figures extracted from www.statista.com. What do the above figures con-



vey? Let me put point-wise analytical inferences.

The economic soundness indices of China and India are quite comparable, with important parameters tilted heavily in India’s favor. The reason? China has grown too fast too much and its growth is unsustainable. The figures speak for themselves. China’s model of economic growth is undemocratic, with capitalist processes foisted on a communist, totalitarian base. This provides an unstable, unsustainable model of economic growth. China has kept the inflation rate low by artificially tight fiscal means through restricted resort to printing more currency, even during the Covid-19 period when GDP and income growth sharply declined. This, seen along with the Communist regime’s restriction on citizens’ savings and withdrawals from their bank accounts, is already causing grave social distress leading to protests and uprisings. With the growth rate declining to 3 percent and the country now in the grip of a most serious Covid-19 pandemic, the short-term economic outlook of the country looks extremely grim.

China’s past growth has been fuelled by exports rather than domestic consumption but with the recent global economic downturn caused by Covid-19 and now the pro-

tracted Russia-Ukraine war, global demand has heavily declined and China’s huge factories are idling to the extent of 40-50 percent on an average. This is exacerbating the already burgeoning domestic debt crisis, with many banks going bust.

It is relevant to observe that China is also present in the midst of an energy crisis with its huge thermal power electricity generating plants starving of coal whose imports from Australia have declined in the recent past due to the worsening of its political relations with that country. The shortage of electricity has put that much additional strain on its manufacturing industry.

The worst thing that could have happened to China is its much-touted BRI running into a quandary. Thanks to China’s opaque policies and systems and unabashedly hegemonic designs, its BRI investments in many countries have run into logjams and the BRI project is turning out to be an unqualified failure. Taking over ports and establishing military bases in the BRI host countries has sullied China’s image and shown it as a business-unfriendly hegemonic power with predatory designs.

It is also important to note India’s advantageous position over China under the present economic circumstances. India’s cost of production is less

than one-fourth of China’s and with a much younger labor workforce; it sits on a much better pedestal for manufacturing sector growth. It can easily wrest from China the position of the global manufacturing hub. The most important factor in India’s favor is its present geopolitical goodwill and China’s worsening relations with major countries owing to its dubious role in the Covid-19 pandemic. In the present situation of political, economic, and social turmoil all over the world in the wake of the Russia-Ukraine war with overt or covert military involvement of many other countries, India is poised well to take the big economic leap forward ahead of China.

China’s economic model has shown now beyond a semblance of doubt that the economic progress of a country is long-term sustainable only with a fair model delivering equitable benefits to collaborating countries. It can never provide long-term, stable economic progress with an exploitative model and undemocratic systems behind it, which are not compatible with the natural development patterns of humans on this planet.

YES BANK AT1 BONDS AFTER THE HC VERDICT


Investors have lost their life savings in bonds of Yes Bank

Four institutional and three individual investors challenged the decision of Yes Bank Limited to write off AT1 bonds from their books in the Bombay High Court. The decision to write off was quashed. Apparently, Yes Bank Limited had sold these bonds to individual investors (apart from institutional investors), terming it as Super Fixed Deposits. Commenting on the judgment of Bombay High Court, Yes Bank MD & CEO Prashant Kumar said that there was no compulsion on the bank to pay interest on or redeem its additional tier-1 (AT1) bonds, which are the subject of litigation with investors. While commenting on the possible impact on the balance sheet of the bank, he said that "the worst case scenario for the bank was that the common equity tier-1 capital – consisting of pure equity without any subordinate debt – would come down. However the capital adequacy would be maintained as the AT1 capital increases."

He has also claimed that it is the discretion of the bank to pay coupon (interest) on the bonds and there is no cumulative nature of coupon payment and in a financial year when the bank is in losses, the bank cannot pay the coupon.



It is true that the information memorandum submitted to SEBI at the time of AT1 bond issue contains the following terms and conditions: (Section 3.f) "Non-Payment due to Bank's weak capital position: Potential investors should be aware that in case the Bank's capital falls below the regulatory requirements, it may not make the payment of the coupon due on the Debentures. The Bank can exercise the said right at an early stage of risk detection."

The following was also there under Clause 54 of the Information memorandum: "Coupon Discretion (i) The Bank shall have full discretion at all times to cancel Coupon either in part or full. On cancellation of payment of Coupon, these payments shall be extinguished and the Bank shall have no obligation to make any distribution/Coupon payment in cash or kind. (ii) The Bonds do not carry a 'dividend pusher' feature i.e. if the Bank makes any payment (coupon/dividend) on any other capital instrument or share, the Bank shall not be obligated to make Coupon payment on the Bonds....."

Hence, the above statement from the bank's spokesperson is perfectly right. But there is another dimension to the cancellation of write-off. At the time of writing off AT1 bond from the books, the bank could have taken the amount to its Profit and Loss Account. Now when the court has disallowed the write off, the reversal entry will be to debit the Profit and Loss Account and bring back the AT1 bond outstanding under Liability.

Hence, the bottom line in the balance sheet will take a hit. The spokesman from the bank has not clarified how the bank will account for it now and what will be its impact.

It is clear from the terms of the AT1 bonds that the bank can decide not to pay any coupon (interest) on the bonds for any number of years. It can also decide to write off the bonds, of course subject to conditions of wiping out equity capital also. Which individual investor could have subscribed for the bond, if she knew that the bank might not pay any interest or even might not pay the principal at all?

It is understood that the bank will approach the Supreme Court against the High Court verdict. It may take any number of years to get the final verdict. Both the regulators, SEBI and RBI, may at least direct the bank for payment of coupon on the debentures to individual investors. Most of these individuals are senior citizens above the age of 70 years and they had given their entire life savings because they were mis-sold these bonds.

A new Great Game begins in Afghanistan

Pakistan might be tempted to test Indo-US strategic ties by launching terror strikes in Kashmir through proxies

After the withdrawal from Afghanistan, the relations between the US and Pakistan have strategically declined. However, Pakistan's fight with TTP, apart from the China-induced economic crisis and the denial of a loan package by the IMF, has renewed American interests in Pakistan.

Reasons for the American interests are varied and have deep connections with the history of South and Central Asia. Despite Islamabad's active support to the Taliban, the American interests will bring the much-required finance and military support, as it has done in the past. The development increases opportunities for Washington to adopt a leapfrog approach again in the two regions to enhance its strategic outreach.


Pakistan lies at the cusp of the two regions. To be more specific, its location to the south of Russia and its 'strategic backyard', i.e. Central Asia makes it relatively important. Historically, the US and Pakistan were joined by China, and their efforts were based on shared interests against the Soviet Union apart from limiting India's political and geostrategic influence in the South Asian region.

From Pakistan's perspective, the US interest allowed it to put forward its 'geostrategic marketability' and extract military leverage against India. In 1954, the US government announced a military aid package of \$500 million instead of its mutual defence assistance agreement. Further, from 1967-1980 the US provided military and technical assistance of around \$6 billion.

Pakistan used this aid against Indian interests. Thus, it adopted the approach of buck passing, which was relatively cheaper than internal and external balancing and bandwagoning. Before any conflict, Pakistan expected the US to guarantee its security. In the first case, before the 1965 war, Ayub Khan had demanded that the United States should accept securing Pakistan against India's "aggression" as an essential component of guarantees provided through an alliance with the US. Although defeated, one cannot deny the US military supplies to Pakistan that made it believe that it could fight India. But Islamabad, too, realized that Washington was not prepared to issue a "blank check" against India. The tables were turned again against India in the 1971 war. Even though Pakistan launched a pre-emptive war against India in 1971, the US' seventh fleet ensured that India did not consider retaking PoK while liberating East Pakistan.

Later, during the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan, Pakistan gained financial support \$3.2 billion from 1980 to 1990, aiding the Mujahideen to fight against the Soviet Union. Additionally, the US supplied Pakistan with F-16.

After the nuclear tests, Pakistan adopted a similar approach and always used its

Islamic state status quo of possessing nuclear weapons, thereby extracting substantial advantages through its nuclear blackmailing. Despite India's readiness to take a limited military action against Pakistan after the Kargil crisis and the attacks on Parliament, it was the US that intervened on the grounds of restoring "normalcy" and substantially limited India's response.

The 9/11 again brought the US and Pakistan in a more tactical embrace with each other. Pakistan became a major non-NATO ally, and as per the SIPRI data, during 2002-14, it got military aid worth \$5.81 billion, of which the arms sales component was \$3.2 billion. After the killing of Osama bin Abbottabad, as per the C.R.S. report, in 2014-15, the total financial and military aid decreased to 40 per cent from 2011-2015. In the years preceding the US exit from Afghanistan, Washington had become diplomatically and strategically dependent on Islamabad to help it handle the coerced talks with the Taliban and smartly ensure its safe exit from the region.

In the process, it made the Taliban and itself essential stakeholders in the region. Pakistan's case study proves that the weak states thrive on the great power insecurities and mismanagement of international politics. In the contemporary situation, the renewed interest of the US in Pakistan has historical interlinkages between Russia and Pakistan apart from the triangular dynamics between Russia, China and Pakistan. Russia has been making positive overtures to Pakistan much before the outbreak of the Ukraine War. Starting from the Iran-Pakistan pipeline in the news in mid-2010, one has witnessed rapid convergences between Russia, China, Pakistan and Iran.

In 2015, Russia lifted its arms embargo on Pakistan. Since then, the two have broadened the horizon of their strategic relations, which included a defence agreement, supply of Mi-35M Hind-E helicopter and joint military exercises apart from signing a 'Rare Military Cooperation Pact' in 2018. Interestingly, Pakistan's military arsenal includes Russia's Klimov RD-93 engine used to make JF-17 Thunder aircraft.

Russia has reignited its interest in the pipeline politics of Iran and Pakistan and has expressed a willingness to supply crude oil to Pakistan. The deal is to be materialized in the "currency of friendly countries", which might slightly dent the Western sanctions on Russia. Further, the Kazakhstan-Pakistan pipeline also has the potential to turn the tables and form new energy architectures. From another perspective, Russia and Pakistan agreement on "practical engagement" on the Afghan Taliban issues have serious undertones for the two regions.

It is pertinent to mention that the US National Security Strategy (2022) has emphasized the issue of terrorism but has deliberately omitted to name the terror modules in Pakistan as a source of terror but mentions the Taliban as a challenge. The document speaks of increasing its "cooperation and support to trusted partners" and "shifting from a strategy that is 'US-led, partner-enabled' to one that is 'partner-led, US-enabled'". The document further hints that the US might be interested in exploiting the emerging fault-lines of Russia-China relations which have emerged as the fallout of the Ukraine war.

Additionally, the US will make its presence felt in Central Asia in the coming few days through the C5+1 diplomatic platform (Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan and the United States).

Now, one needs to brainstorm what position Pakistan will occupy in this "partner-led, US-enabled" strategy to finish terror? The most pertinent question is how Pakistan would exploit the insecurities and fear of Russia, the US, and China vis-à-vis each other? What military and financial packages will Pakistan get hold of in this new emerging great power game? Will the Afghan Taliban, Tehrik e Taliban Pakistan (TTP), and other Islamic groups be finally crushed? Will there be another military onslaught in Afghanistan as it was in 1979-80?

From an Indian perspective, while coordinating with the US to crush the TTP, Pakistan might be tempted to test the Indo-US strategic relations by launching simultaneous terror strikes in Kashmir through its proxies. If so, would the US be neutral again and insist on "normalcy"? Pakistan thus has a well-designed strategy to play the US and Russia off of one another to enhance its security against the possible Indian response to its misadventures in India, gain military and financial packages and finally, slow down the US-China hostility.

All these factors may constrain India's options to enhance its posturing on crucial future developments. The emerging faultlines remind us of an American mathematician John Allen Paules who stated: "Uncertainty is the only certainty there is, and knowing how to live with this insecurity is the only security".

Disruptive innovation often shakes up an industry

For disruption to happen, a company has to target an overlooked customer base, provide a right fit of product or service

Innovation, which is advancement over an existing product or idea, is a prerequisite for continuous improvement. But a disruptive innovation shakes up an industry once in a while. Disruptive innovation in business is not a new concept. It took birth in 1995 when it was proposed by one of the world's leading thinkers on innovation Christensen along with his co-authors.

However, over the years, this concept has been misunderstood. It has generally been misapplied to a situation where the industry norms are shaken up and existing players stirred. And here's where the catch is. Originally, Christensen ideated the concept of disruption, more like a David and Goliath situa-

tion— a smaller company with fewer resources successfully challenging an established business.

Established businesses in their effort to retain their existing majority target customer base, focus mainly on improving their present products or services and largely ignore other market segments. New entrants that sense this gap provide products or services lucrative to the overlooked segments.

While the established businesses do not pay heed to these new entrants, they slowly make inroads into upmarket, providing the same products or services to the majority customers whilst retaining their earlier advantage—lower prices. Once these mainstream

the new products or services, in large quantities, one can say disruption has occurred.

According to Christensen, potential for disruptive innovations arise because established businesses ignore both low-end and new markets. In an attempt to be more profitable, established businesses concentrate on providing mainstream customers with high quality products and services and commit resources in upgrading, enhancing and perfecting their existing products and services, all the while ignoring the low-end market. Sensing this opportunity, new entrants foray into this gap by using a low-cost business model. A low-end disruptor snatches the market share in this segment and pushes the established businesses upmar-

ket. Additionally, disruption can occur by creating new markets where none existed, by developing new products for consumers, at a lower price and an acceptable quality. Arrival of personal computers, and later smartphones are perfect examples of new-market disruption.

The first computers, known as mainframes, were huge and very expensive. With costs as high as \$2 million and size as big as to fill an entire room, computing technology was out of bounds for the common man. With the invention of the personal computer, a small and affordable piece of machine, a new market segment of individuals was created.

Over the years, with continuous improvement in its capabilities, a humble personal computer made the mainframe computers virtually obsolete. The next step in new market disruption is the emergence of smartphones, which are creating disruptions at two levels. One, the ability to use the internet in a phone at a fraction of cost of a personal computer is making usage of personal computers less necessary. Two, smartphone photograph taking capabilities are set to disrupt the digital photography industry.

However, over the years, the above concept has been misused by many who have not given a serious thought about the notion itself. Internationally, Uber has been touted as a disruption. It uses mobile applications to connect consumers who need rides with drivers who are willing to provide them. Founded in 2009, the company has enjoyed fantastic growth and is still expanding. It has reported tremendous financial success, with funding rounds and soaring valuation. No doubt, Uber has transformed the business of transportation.

But has it brought about disruption? For disruption to happen, a company has to target an overlooked customer base, provide a right fit of product or service, usually at a lower cost. Uber connected the end users, i.e., customers used to taking cab services, to service providers. So, Uber did not fulfil any of the two conditions to become a disrupter – firstly, it did not bring the market segment that did not use cab services



Corporate budget that hits States financially: Harish

BRS came down heavily on the Budget and termed it as a 'corporate budget' that hits States financially.

Finance Minister T Harish Rao said, "Anti-farmer budget, anti-employee budget, the budget that will push the country into debt, the budget that does not give relief to employees, corporate budget, the budget that will hit states financially, budget that ignores education and medical sectors and budget that offers nothing to Telangana."

The Central government has cut funds in the budget for the employment guarantee scheme. While Rs 89,400 crore was allocated in the last budget, this time it was reduced to Rs 60,000 crore.

There are massive cuts in food security funding for the poor as Rs 2,87,194 crore was allocated in 2022-23, but this time it has been reduced to Rs 1,97,350 crore. That meant Rs 89,844 crore had been cut for food subsidy in this budget.



The Center has sanctioned 157 medical colleges to various States in the country, but not a single one has been given to Telangana. Now, the Centre announced that nursing colleges would also be set up in the areas where 157 medical colleges were granted earlier.

Last year's budget allocated Rs 68,000 crore for PM Kisan Fund, but this time the Centre reduced it to Rs 60,000 crore in the budget. At the same time, the Centre is reducing the number of farmers who are getting the benefit. PM Kisan

earlier benefited 11.27 crore farmers, now the number of farmers has been reduced to 8.99 crores.

There is a huge cut in fertiliser subsidy to farmers. Rs 2, 25, 220 crore funds had been allocated in 2022-23 RE, but it has been reduced to Rs 1, 75, 100 crore in this financial year. That meant a direct cut of Rs 50,120 crore. To purchase cotton at a support price through Cotton Corporation of India in last year's budget Rs 9,243 crore have been allocated, but this time only Rs one lakh has been

allocated in the budget. Under the Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana, Rs 10,433 crore were allocated in the last year's budget, but this time it has been reduced to Rs 7,150 crore in the budget. That meant a cut of Rs 3,283 crore had been made. While Rs 5020 crore was allocated in last year's budget for minorities, this time it was reduced to Rs 3,097 crore in the budget.

"Since 1979-80 the revenue deficit at the centre has been steadily increasing. The revenue deficit was Rs 694 crore in 1979-80, it has increased to Rs11,10,546 crore in 2022-23 as per the revised estimates. This is against FRBM Act. Even if the States comply with the FRBM norms, non-compliance by the Center may undermine the fiscal discipline of the country. The Center is strictly implementing the FRBM rules even on the states that are doing well, but it is violating the FRBM rules from time to time, misusing the power in its hands and taking exceptions", Harish said.

Residents leave village for a day to ward off evil

Attending our pets' gatherings like these puts a stamp on

humanising your pet. Increasingly urban societies attend every year, and we see how they know about veterinary telehealth, first-class dog food, their accessories, and more."

The Hyderabad Canine Club's love for animals is so great that they are letting people know that dogs are not scary to be around, despite a few strange incidents across the country. "Pets own the city now — they have taken on the role of playmates. Whenever I see so many breeds of animals coming together for our shows, it's like peacekeepers coming with elan. 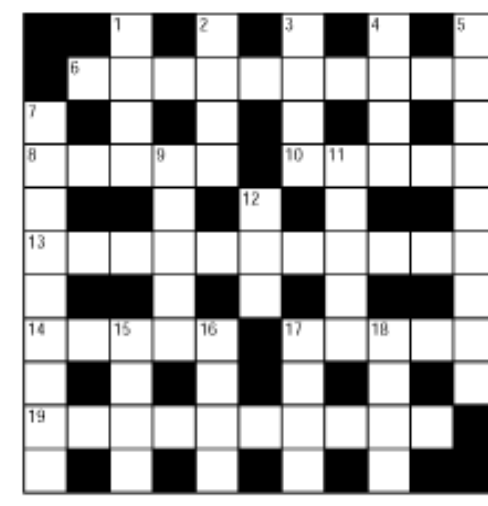

Later, after his father had passed away, he had to move back to Hyderabad. It was at that time, he met filmmaker Sukumar, who recently scored a hit with *Pushpa*, and travelled with the ace film right from *Jagadam* to *Pushpa 2*.

The director shared he was confident since day one that *Kappela* could be remade into Telugu. “I happened to watch *Kappela* during Covid and I really liked the screenplay of the film. Only a few films can be remade into other languages. When it comes to *Kappela*, it is a script based film, so it can be made into any language. That’s the reason I chose this particular film and more than anything it excited me as a filmmaker. And I always had the confidence that it would go well with our audience. Later, I got to know that Sithara Entertainment bought the rights for the film and I approached them.”

The film is being appreciated for the casting choices and the debutant said, “We were searching for someone who’d look really innocent. In that process, I happened to see Anikha in Gautham Vasudev Menon’s web series and I felt she’s the right fit for the role. When it comes to Arjun Das, our producer Naga Vamsi was really excited to see him play the part. And after looking at Surya Vasishta’s audition clips, we locked in on him after discussing with the producers. All the three actors will surely create an impact on the audience. There’s also a major screenplay change in the first half and I think after watching *Butta Bomma*, even the Kappela director might envy that particular change. Apart from that we tried our level best to capture those nuances that the story demanded. I am not worried about comparisons. And I feel the original films didn’t penetrate the local areas in our states. So, I thought we could take a chance,” informed the *Butta Bomma* creator.

Everyone is aware of the close relationship that Sithara Entertainments holds with master director Trivikram Srinivas. When the first timer was asked if Trivikram Srinivas ever suggested any changes to the script, he replied, “He never interfered while we were shooting for the film but after watching the film in its entirety, he suggested a few changes and we immediately made all those changes.”

There’s this idea that romantic films only garner critical success and don’t make astronomical box-office numbers. “I never believed in that philosophy. I feel it all depends on its merit. If you’re able to honestly instil emotions with your story and keep the audience hooked to the seats, that film is bound to work. I felt really happy when Chinna Babu garu complimented me after watching the movie. I can’t reveal as to why he complimented me because I’d be letting you all in on an important twist,” assured the director.

Sowri Chandrasekhar T Ramesh looks super confident about the success of *Butta Bomma* and is keen on making films in the action genre. “I don’t have any reservations in terms of who I want to cast in my films. I’m open to casting anyone who goes well with the character and the story. Everything depends on the script,” wrapped the filmmaker.
