

Adani group stocks, where LIC is heavily invested, have lost over USD 100 billion in value since a tiny New York short seller came out with a damning report alleging financial and accounting fraud by the ports-to-energy conglomerate. The Adani group has denied all charges and called the report malicious and full of lies.

The family members of Balakoti Reddy told the media that three people barged into his house and fired two rounds with a revolver and fled the scene. Balakoti Reddy collapsed and he was shifted to the Government General Hospital where he was undergoing treatment. Family members alleged that Gadam Venkata Rao, Pammi Venkateswara Reddy, and Pujala Ramudu were behind the murder attempt.

After BCs, YSRCP focusses on Minority outreach



In an interview to PTI, Malhotra said the government does not have any specific timeline to make the new regime mandatory for

taxpayers.
"We would like to move towards a lower tax rate, which is simple and without tax exemptions," Malhotra said.

Talking to the media here on Thursday, SP Ravishankar Reddy said that financial disputes are the reason for the murder attempt on Balakoti Reddy.

He said that Venkateswara Reddy and Anji Reddy and the deceased Balakoti Reddy became friends when they were in Narasaraopet prison. The SP denied a political motive for the murder attempt. One of the accused in the murder attempt Anji Reddy purchased a revolver for Rs 60,000 in Rajasthan. The victim Balakoti Reddy and the accused Venkateswara Reddy were TDP leaders, the SP said.

The police arrested four persons in connection with the murder attempt on Balakoti Reddy and cases under section 307 registered, the SP said. The SP also made it clear that the husband of Rompicherla MPP is not involved in the murder attempt case.

Meanwhile, Narasaraopet in-charge

Chadalavada Aravind Babu visited Balakoti Reedy. He alleged that MLA Gopireddy Srinivasa Reddy was involved in the murder attempt case. Aravinda Babu said that the condition of Balakoti Reddy turned out to be critical and he was shifted to a private hospi-

tal for better treatment. TDP leader former Minister Nakka Ananda Babu also visited Balakoti Reddy in a private hospital in Narasaraopet. He inquired about his health condition with the doctors. US firm to set up nuclear reactors in Kovvada

Minister of Earth Sciences Dr. Jitendra Singh revealed that talks are being held with the Westinghouse Company (USA) for setting up six nuclear reactors in Kovvada at Srikakulam district of Andhra Pradesh. This was in a written reply to a question posed by YSRCP MP V Vijayasai Reddy in the Rajya Sabha during the third day of the Parliament session, on

Thursday.

The Minister explained that after the negotiations with the Westinghouse Company, the project proposals will be finalized with details such as the cost of setting up the Kovvada nuclear power plant and the time taken for construction. Currently, the pre-construction activities of the project are ongoing. Land acquisition, obtaining necessary permissions for the project, and studying the topography of the project site are underway.

He stated that 2,079 acres of land are required for the Kovvada nuclear power project. Land acquisition of 2061 acres has been completed so far. In his reply, the Minister mentioned that the transfer of this land in the name of the Nuclear Power Corporation has also been completed.

Around 8,000 people will Nuclear Power Plant. BUDGET SESSION FROM TODAY

All eyes on KCR-Governor

All eyes are on the Telangana budget session starting on February 3, that is Friday, amidst the twists and turns for approval of the fiscal 2023-34 annual budget.

Everyone is curiously waiting to see the conduct of Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao and the Governor, Dr Tamilisai Soundararajan, in the Assembly as they have not been on good terms for the last two years.

As per protocol, the Chief Minister, Speaker and others have to receive the Governor when the Governor comes to the Assembly to address the joint session.

Both the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council will commence on Friday. The budget session will commence with Governor Dr Tamilisai Soundararajan's address to a joint session at the Assembly Hall at 12.10 pm. The Governor is going to address the joint session after two years. The rift between the

Telangana government avoided the Governor's address stating that the House has not been prorogued and that the session is not a new one. This year too, the state government tried to avoid the Governor's address. However, the Governor did not give permission to introduce the budget in the Assembly and Council.

Due to the Governor's attitude, the state government went to the High Court. However, the HC suggested to the counsels of both the State government and the Governor's office to discuss the issue and come to an amicable decision. Following the High Court's decision, both the counsels accepted to run the House as per Constitutional norms. The government agreed to allow the Governor's address.

On the same day, the Government approached the Governor and invited her to address the joint session. The next day the Governor issued a notification for the budget session with the same dates given by the

However, it is learnt that the

government has sent the Governor's address copy to Raj Bhavan but the Governor has not yet approved it.

On the other hand, the authorities have been making arrangements on Thursday unlike it had done in the past. Generally, the government completes arrangements a couple of days before the session's commencement date.

The Assembly and the Council will move resolutions on the Motion of Thanks to the Governor's address on February

4 separately in both the Houses. Finance Minister Harish Rao will present the budget in the Assembly and Assembly Affairs Minister Prashanth Reddy in the Council at 11 am on February 6. February 7th will be given leave

to study the budget.

The Assembly will be held for five days from the 8th and with the approval of the appropriation Bill, both the houses will be adjourned indefinitely. The CAG report will be presented in this session. It is informed that the election of the deputy chairman of the council is also possible.

Maha ATS files chargesheet against five arrested PFI members

he Maharashtra Anti Terrorism Squad on Thursday filed its chargesheet against five members of the now-banned Popular Front of India who were arrested after raids in September last year for allegedly indulging in anti-national activities and waging war against the nation. The chargesheet was filed before special judge AM Patil. The five have been charged under provisions of the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act and Indian Penal Code for various offences, including promoting enmity among different groups and conspiring to commit offences against the State. More than 100 functionar-

ies of the radical Islamist group were arrested in nationwide raids in several states, including Maharashtra, in September last year. Subsequently, the PFI was banned by the Central government through a notification issued on September 27, in which it said the outfit and its affiliates have been involved in subversive activities, thereby disturbing public order and undermining the constitutional set up of the country.



Centre spent nearly Rs 27,000 lakh on preservation of cultural sites

he central government has spent Rs 26,957.32 lakh on conservation, preservation and maintenance of monuments and sites of national importance in 2021-22, Parliament was informed on Thursday. Union Culture Minister G Kishan Reddy, in a written response to a query, also shared data on the revenue generated through entry fee at monuments and sites at 143 locations in the country during the last three years. There are 3,696 centrally-protected monuments in the country which fall under the purview of the Archaeological Survey of India, including 743

sites in Uttar Pradesh, 506 in Karnataka, and 412 in Tamil Nadu. Reddy also shared details on the expenditure on conservation, preservation and maintenance of monuments and sites of national importance during last three years. In 2019-20, the figures stood at Rs 43,538.76 lakh while the corresponding figures for 2020-21 was Rs 26,083.41 lakh, and Rs 26,957.32 lakh for 2021-22, according to the data



7.81 crore rural households provided tap water: Govt

ore than 7.81 crore rural households have been provided tap water connections under the Jal Jeevan Mission over last three years, Minister of State for Jal Shakti Prahlad Singh Patel informed the Lok Sabha on Thursday. In a written reply to a question, the minister said as on January 31, 2023, out of 19.36 crore rural households in the country, around 11.06 crore (57.12 per cent) are reported to have tap water supply. Panel for 'specific' study on Mussoorie, remedial steps

A bench comprising Chairperson Justice AK Goel said a holistic study of the carrying capacity of eco-sensitive areas in the Himalayan regions was imperative for protection of the environment.

The bench, also comprising Judicial Member Justice Sudhir Agarwal and Expert Members A Senthil Vel and Afroz Ahmad, said, "Without under-



eco-sensitive areas... we direct specific study for Mussoorie...

"Such study may cover as to how much constructions can be allowed and with what safeguards, what safeguards be used for existing buildings and all other relevant and associated aspects including vehicular traffic, sanitation management, maintaining ecological integrity in terms of soil stability and flora/fauna,' the bench said.

The bench also formed a nine-member joint committee headed by the Uttarakhand chief secretary.

Other committee members include the Central Pollution Control Board, ACS Environment, Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology, Govind Ballabh Pant National Institute of Himalaya and Environment, National Institute of Hydrology, Space Application Centre and National Institute of Rock Mechanics, the bench said.

Consider modifying prisoners' bail: SC

Noting that a number of undertrial prisoners are in jail even after being granted bail, the Supreme Court has asked courts concerned to consider modifying the conditions imposed if the bonds were not furnished

"In cases where the undertrial or convict requests that he can

furnish bail bonds or sureties once released, then in an appropriate case, the court may consider granting temporary bail for a specified period to the accused so that he can furnish bail bonds or sureties.

"If the bail bonds are not furnished within one month from the date of grant bail, the concerned court may suo motu take up the case and consider whether the conditions of bail require modifications or relaxations," the bench said. The

court granting bail to an undertrial prisoner or a convict would be required to e-mail a soft copy of the order to the prisoner through the jail superintendent on the same day or the next day. "The jail superintendent would be required to enter the date of grant of bail in the e-prisons software (or any other software being used by the

prison department). "If the accused is not released within a period of

top court also directed that a seven days from the date of grant of bail, it would be the duty of the superintendent of jail to inform the secretary, DLŚA, who may depute a paralegal volunteer or jail-visiting advocate to interact with the prisoner and assist the prisoner in all ways possible for his release," the bench said.

Time to act

The Government and regulators must ensure the meltdown of Adani stocks doesn't cause more pain

mid the war in Ukraine, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's message to Russian President Vladimir Putin was: "Today's era must not be of war." With bloodbath on Dalal Street unabated, his Government must send a similar message across the political parties. The facts are horrifying. After the publication of the Hindenburg Research report, the market-cap of seven listed Adani Group companies has declined by about \$100 billion. The Adani Group had to call off its Rs 20,000-crore follow-on public offering (FPO), the largest in the country, to shield its investors from potential losses. Group chairman Gautam Adani said in a statement that "it would not be morally correct" to proceed with the FPO. In fact, the entire stock market, especially banking scrips, has



suffered because of the meltdown of Adani shares. Even the excellent Budget, which has been widely hailed as pro-growth, could not lift the investors' spirits. It must be noted here that the free fall of Adani shares should not be seen as something that only its promoters and investors (institutional or retail) should be worried about; this also affects banks which have lent to the group. Furthermore, this also affects the public exchequer, for most banks in our country are in the public sector; and losses to them necessitate recapitalisation, which the taxpayer has to bear. Consider this fact: public sector banks had to be paid Rs 310,997 crore of taxpayer money for their recapitalisation in just four years, between 2016-17 and 2020-21.

Against this backdrop, the response of the political class to the crisis occasioned by the US short-seller Hindenburg's report is anything but responsible; instead of taking on the crisis head on, our politicians are trying to score brownie points. In Parliament, Opposition parties demanded a discussion on the risks Indian investors face because of the unrelenting decline of Adani shares. They also demanded an investigation by a parliamentary committee or one appointed by the Supreme Court. Both Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and Rajya Sabha Chairperson Jagdeep Dhankhar rejected these demands, leading to pandemonium in the Houses. The Government's silence over the mayhem in the capital market is not helping anyone. The Adani Group has also failed to convince the investors. Calling Hindenburg as the "Madoffs of Manhattan" which has "no credibility or ethics" doesn't do any good to the conglomerate. Its invocation of nationalism — labeling Hindenburg's allegations as not "merely an unwarranted attack on any specific company but a calculated attack on India" and its growth story — also cut no ice. Not with the investors anyway; the Hindenburg report seems to have woken them up, for it was not secret that Adani stocks were majorly overvalued. Hindenburg's allegations of fraud and market manipulation are new though. Even if the allegations are wrong, one wonders why didn't the regulators never warned and took against overvaluation. It is time for action.



Don't Weaken MNREGA

Allocation for MNREGA has been slashed in the

Budget which would hit hard the downtrodden ■hile the tax slabs hogged the limelight of the Budget 2023 presented by finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman, one thing that has been overlooked by most is that the budget for the MNREGA has been slashed along with other social security schemes. The impact of weakening MNREGA could be really bad for the rural poor. Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MNREGA) is the lifeline for poor village women workers who work in the vicinity of their homes to earn their subsistence. The Finance Minister has reduced the allocation to MNREGA to Rs 60,000 crore, the lowest in the last four budgets. This year's budget allocation for the scheme has declined by 29000 crores. The scheme was introduced in 2005 by the Congress-led United Progressive Alliance and is aimed at ensuring the livelihood security of households in rural areas. The demand-driven scheme quarantees 100



days of unskilled work annually for every rural household and covers all districts in the country. In fact, it has been so popular that even the World Bank took note of it and praised it. MNREGA has been ranked as the world's largest public works program by the World bank, providing social security net to almost 15 percent of the country's population.

Besides MNREGS, the government has cut down the National Social Assistance Program to Rs 9,636.32 crore from the 2022-23 revised estimate of Rs 9,652 crore. The program provides financial assistance to the elderly, widows, and persons with disabilities in the form of social pensions. The budget for Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2, aimed at welfare of chil-

dren and women, has been brought down to Rs 20,263 from the 2022-'23 revised estimate of Rs 20.554. It is rather sad that the Central Government is reducing the subsidies and also weakening the social security net which is the need of the hour, especially after the pandemic as many people who suffered have not recovered fully. MNREGA is an excellent scheme for it provides work and does not give freebies and that too in the vicinity of the beneficiaries so is convenient for the women. In 2022-23 6.49 crore households demanded work under the Scheme. Out of this, 6.48 crore households were offered employment by the government. The budget allocation to MNREGA as for other social schemes must not be cut, it would hit the poorest of the poor. The Govt must revise its budget allocation to strengthen the social security.



The Economic Survey is a policy document that gives a diagnostic report regarding the state of the economy and growth prospects. The survey for 2022-2023 (based on nearly nine months of economic data for the fiscal) is far more insightful on the tone of the ecopolitical narrative, which is going to play out in the run up to the mother of all democratic processes, the national general elections of 2024.

In a somewhat break from past Economic Surveys, this year's economic survey seems more of a political document, highlighting through charts, graphs and illustrations, the economic welfare agenda of the current government starting from 2014. It was expected to be in the budget, but with the economic survey grabbing many of those, easy to grasp charts, suggests that the Modi government is really gearing up for pushing India to be the third largest world economy in about a decade's time (caveat that is two new governments, one or both of which is unlikely to have Mr Modi leading the country from the front).



The Economic Survey highlights the reforms regime brought in by the current government immediately after it came to power, which were aimed at enhancing the overall structural efficiency and fundamentals of the economy. The finance ministry's press statement read: "With an underlying emphasis on improving the ease of living and doing business, the reforms after 2014 were based on the broad principles of creating public goods, adopting trust-based governance, co-partnering with the private sector for development, and improving agricultural productivity."

Some examples of those reforms included improved fiscal transparency and realistic revenue assumptions in the budget bringing down extra budgetary borrowings for the government to nearly nil for fiscal year 2023. The major reforms from previous budget documents highlighted in the economic survey included reduction in non-plan expenditure in the budget, thereby, efficiently streamlining government's expenditures towards targeted sectors, while sticking to a fiscal discipline.

The merger of the railways budget with the main budget since fiscal year 2018 helped the government have better management of finances and allowed the finance ministry to focus more money on the integrated infrastructure divisions of railways, roads and ports more efficiently. The Economic Survey did not mention that this smart move brought an efficiency in railways governance, which prior 2014, has been used as a separate vote bank, since some of the most visible and sought after government jobs are in the railways. Finally, the Economic survey does highlight that advancing the general budget to February 1 gives an additional month for all departments of the government for better planning and implementation of the budget schemes.

It is important to understand that the Economic survey presents a macro narrative for the political economy. This document has tons of easily digestible data. The Survey for the first time includes chapters on social sector and climate change and environment, two themes very close to the Prime Minister's inclusive sustainable economic growth agenda. The preface reads, "These chapters highlight how the use of technology has enhanced the quality of life for citizens to ensure the reach of social sector schemes to intended beneficiaries, especially during the pandemic. The transformations in the lives of the citizens happening through the Aspirational Districts Programme, Direct Benefit Transfers, use of Aadhaar and various initiatives in the education, health and basic infrastructure availability are highlights of the chapter."

Clearly the economic report card of Modi government's two consecutive terms is out, and much to the innovative thinking of the current bunch of policy makers, who have pushed it out even before the opposition parties have asked for it. This sets the agenda and helps the political class to take the lead in the perception game. It is up to the various political players within the ruling dispensation to take advantage. ven as the finances of states were beginning to look better as reflectded in decline in the ratio of state government debt to GDP from 31.2 per cent during 2021-22 to 29.5 per cent during 2022-23—as per the budgetary estimate (BE) —the political brass in different states have made populist announcements which don't augur well for the future. One of these relates to the revival

of the old pension scheme (OPS).

Making a statement in the Lok Sabha, the Minister of State for Finance Bhagwat Kishanrao Karad said, "The state governments of Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, and Jharkhand have informed the Central government about their decisions to restart OPS for their respective employees."

The Congress government in Himachal Pradesh has also announced restoration of OPS. In view of impending elections in nine state assemblies during 2023 and almost all non-BJP parties more than willing to please voters, more and more states are expected to join the bandwagon. As for the central government employees, although for now, Karad informed Parliament that the Centre has no proposal to resurrect the OPS.

At the outset, let us understand pension. A pension provides a person with monthly income when he is old and hence not productive enough to be able to earn. The increase in life expectancy and rise in the cost of living further reinforces the need for assured monthly income for a decent and dignified life in old age.

Under the OPS, retired employees received 50 per cent of their last drawn salary as monthly pension. As on date, the minimum pension paid by the government is Rs 9,000 a month, and the maximum is Rs 62,500 (50 per cent of the highest pay in the Central government, which is Rs 125,000 a month).

Just as the government offers its employees an adjustment in dearness allowance or DA - calculated as a percentage of the basic salary – to offset increase in the cost of living, the monthly payouts of pensioners also increases. Since, the DA hikes are announced twice a year, generally in January and July, a retiree also gets hikes in pension. For instance, with a 4 per cent increase in DA, a pensioner eligible for Rs 62,500 would get a monthly pension of Rs 65,000.

A government employee under OPS could not have gotten anything better. He was entitled to a decent 'pre-determined' monthly amount; the pension was fully protected against inflation and got it as long as he lived. After death, his wife gets the same amount for seven years and thereafter the family pension being around 60 per cent of this till she is alive.

However, from the perspective of the government, the arrangement could not have been worse. Given the architecture of the scheme, there was an inherent tendency of pension liabilities to balloon due

to addition to the pensioners' club every year, higher salaries of those joining, inflation indexation, increased longevity and so on. The proof of pudding is in the eating.

In 1990-91, the Centre's pension bill was Rs 3,272 crore. By

2020-21, it had jumped 58 times to Rs 190,886 crore. The outgo for all states put together shot up 125 times from Rs 3,131 crore in 1990-91 to Rs 386,001 crore in 2020-21. Overall, pension payments by states accounted for a quarter of their own tax revenues. For some states, pension pay-

ments took away a much higher share of their own tax revenue. For Himachal Pradesh, it was 80 per cent whereas for Punjab and Rajasthan, it was 35 per cent and 30 per cent respectively.

After payment of wages and salaries to the serving employees and other routine expenses, hardly any money was left with these states for meeting development and welfare expenses.

Prudent financial management required that every year, the government set aside capital which together with return accruing CORPORATE thereon would create a growing corpus sufficient to pay for the pension liabilities. This would have provided for a sustainable basis for discharging these liabilities without causing any stress on the budget. In short, there was a need for funding the pension liability. That was never done.

İnstead, both the Centre and states have followed 'pay-as-yougo' impacting their budgets in a totally uncontrolled manner, besides making the present generation of taxpayers to bear the continuously rising burden of pensioners. Moreover, given the persistent shortfall in tax revenue, they were forced to borrow more and more thereby passing on the burden to future generations of taxpayers as well.

According to an expert committee (2000) under S A Dave, a former chairman of SEBI, on Old Age Social and Income Security (OASIS), just 3.4 crore people, or less than 11 per cent of the estimated total working population of 31.4 crore (as per 1991 census), had some post-retirement income security such as government pension, Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), or the Employee Pension Scheme (EPS).

The rest of the workforce had no means of post-retirement economic security. In this backdrop, using a disproportionate share of state resources for benefiting a tiny section of the working population was iniquitous and unconscionable.

To address the above concerns, a new pension scheme (NPS) was introduced for government employees joining service from January 1, 2004. NPS is a contributory pension scheme under which employees contribute 10 per cent of their salary (Basic + Dearness Allowance). The government conemployees' NPS accounts.

NPS is free from all the maladies afflicting OPS. It offers a selffinancing and fully funded arrangement for discharging pension liabilities in which the state knows for certain 'how much it has to contribute. There won't be any major stress on the budget even as the employee gets a good pension depending on the amount of contribution made, the age of joining, type of investment, and the income accruing from that investment.

Under this scheme, the pensioner enjoys a lot of flexibility; he to OPS.

bonds or government securities. The government has made NPS more attractive by offering fiscal incentives such as deduction up to 10 per cent of salary (basic+ DA) within overall ceiling of Rs.150,000/-u/s 80C in respect of employee contribution; deduction up to Rs.50,000 u/s 80 CCD(1B) for additional (albeit voluntary) contribution and deduction up to 10 per cent of salary u/s 80 CCD(2) towards employer contribution (this is over and above the limits u/s 80C).

The NPS has also addressed the inequity issue by providing a platform to the private sector, including the unorganised sector to secure pension post-retirement.

As on October 31, 2022, apart from around 8,200,000 subscribers in the government (states 5,900,000 and Centre 2,300,000), the corporate sector had about 1,600,000 subscribers, and the unorganised sector 2,550,000. In addition, there were around 4,200,000 subscribers under the NPS Swavalamban schemedesigned especially for the poor and the under-privileged citizens.

Having made good progress in providing a sustainable basis for financing pension liabilities under NPS, for states now to go back to OPS is a retrograde move. This must be avoided or else India could plunge into fiscal catastrophe, come 2034 when they will have to start paying pension to the first lot of those who came under NPS in 2004 and now being shifted

Monthly GST revenue at Rs 1.50L cr to be new normal next fiscal: CBIC chief

Monthly GST collection is expected to average around Rs 1.50 lakh crore and it will be the new normal' in FY24 in view of concerted efforts to check evasion and bring new businesses within the GST net, Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) chief Vivek Johri said on Thursday.

In an interview to PTI, Johri said the GST and Customs revenue collection numbers as given in Budget 2023-24 are realistic based on nominal GDP growth and import trends, respectively and the indirect tax collection target set for next fiscal will be

achieved. Johri said CBIC has drawn up a strategy to augment GST mop-up by way of stricter audit and scrutiny of tax returns, enforcement action against fake billing and input tax credit claims.

'We will focus on increasing the taxpayer base. Even er base has been quite good, we have more than doubled the number of taxpayers from the time we started GST, we feel there are some sectors which have much more potential to increase the taxpayer population.

So I feel we have not reached the saturation level and there is scope for increasing the revenue," Johri said.



aving been born into a family of musicians, Kaushiki Chakraborty is much more than just a classical vocalist. While most toddlers love playing with toys, Kaushiki was interested in music. In her illustrious career, she has lent her voice to a number of Hindi, Bengali, and South Indian films.

A ten-day music concert featuring legendary Indian artists was recently held in Hyderabad to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary week of Shri Ram Chandraji Maharaj of Fatehgar known as Lalaji—the founder of the Shri Ram Chandra Mission. The Pioneer quickly connected with the virtuoso, who opened up about creative challenges, being compared with the veterans, the Indian Classical music scene, and more.

Being the torchbearer of the Patiala Gharana

tradition that was popularised by Bade Ghulam Ali Khan, Kaushiki feels that creative challenges are a process of growth. "Creative challenges are very personal for an artist and very difficult to put into words. They are a part of the process of growth. As an artist, when you grow, you go through transitions, and there are many phases of transitions. You break yourself and rebuild your craft, and every time you redefine yourself, you position yourself apart from it. So I think it's a constant process. It is not something that has happened in the past and would not happen. It's a constant, throbbing, growing discipline. Whichever way I am perceived now has nothing to do with my personal journey of growing as a musician. Creative challenges are many, and they keep happening. That's how it is and should be. It's a healthy way to develop. When you listen to

different way,", which is my state of mind at the current moment." They say that being mentally prepared for a performance is just as important as being physically prepared. For her, maintaining a balance among all the elements is an ideal performance.

Kaushiki has been revered for experimenting with her singing, which she believes comes from a great deal of comfort with music. Being one of the most sought-after voices, Kaushiki has been compared to many veteran female singers, but

Back in the day people chose a simple minimalist ear lobe or nose piercing but today this trend has found its way to the belly, eyebrows, eyelashes, nose, lip, and even tongue! The question is do we really need to 'hop on the bandwagon' just to 'look cool' without

founder of House of Tooth in Mumbai. explains the possible complications oral piercings can cause and how adequate research needs to be carried out before getting a metal poked in your mouth. Talking about oral piercings she states that your mouth is known to contain millions of bacteria and usually infection and swelling are the most common complications postoral piercings. For instance, your mouth and tongue may swell to the point where your airway is closed or you could choke if the piercing breaks into your mouth.

INFECTION:

Your mouth hosts millions of breeding bacteria which is an ideal environment for an infection to take place. This includes bloodborne hepatitis, angina, and herpes. An oral piercing is a foreign object in the mouth that increases the chances of developing an allergic reaction and soft tissue infection

INFLAMMATION WITH PAIN:

Pain and swelling are common symptoms of oral piercings. Worst case scenario your mouth and tongue may swell to the point where your airway is closed leading to difficulty in breathing or you could choke if piercing breaks in your mouth.


UNCONTROLLABLE BLEEDING: If a blood vessel is punctured by the needle during piercing, it could lead to uncontrollable bleeding, gum recession and

CHIPPED OR CRACKED TEETH: If you bite too hard on your piercing there's a chance of chipping or cracking the tooth. Constant contact can progress to a fracture which will eventually need tooth removal. Teeth with prosthesis such as crowns or veneers or previously done fillings can also be damaged if the piercing hits against them.

RECEDING GUMS:

severe blood loss.

Oral piercings can irritate and injure soft gum tissue causing long-term irreversible recession of gums, exposing the root of the tooth, and making the teeth more prone to decay and periodontal disease. Piercings in the mouth can interfere with normal oral function and cause excessive delay in your ability to pronounce words properly, and the flow of saliva and cause difficulty with swallowing and chewing. If you choose to have your mouth pierced or if you already have - don't fret! Make sure you get it done from a shop that is well sanitised and clean. Make sure the piercer keeps in



mind all the sanitisation protocols, is well experienced and adequately trained, and the gloves and needles used are disposable and not reused for anyone else.

Guidelines to avoid complications:

- Immediately just after the piercing make sure that your piercing heals, and doesn't get infected. You can rinse your mouth with salt and warm water or an antibacterial mouthwash. Be patient for about 3/4 weeks till it completely heals. Choose a lightweight plastic piercing to reduce your chances of tooth damage.
- Do not try to remove, disturb or twist your piercing before the area is completely healed.
- Avoid smoking or chewing tobacco as it interferes with the healing process. Avoid eating anything spicy, salty, or acidic. Stick to soft meals and comfort
- No hot drinks, like coffee, tea, or hot

Keep checking for any signs of infection after a piercing. If you have an unusual discharge, swelling, tenderness, redness, bleeding, rash and fever, immediately consult a doctor

Is there a safe way to keep an oral piercing?

Dr. Kshama says, "As long as your mouth stays free of infection and your oral piercings don't interfere with your normal dental routine, they can stay in your mouth indefinitely. Practice good oral hygiene, brushing and flossing twice daily. Keep regular appointments for teeth cleanings and check-ups. Those already having a piercing should be screened by a dental professional for early detection of the adverse effects and for possible complications on a regular basis. Just make sure you see your dentist at the first sign of pain or swelling with your oral piercing. There are many other ways to express yourself which do not involve permanently damaging your mouth. But, if you are considering getting on or you already have an oral piercing, be mindful about following the advice and prevent

TACKLING SLIDE SPIN WILL BE KEY TO OZ'S Technically & tactically, SUCCESS IN INDIA, SAYS McDONALD

ustralia head coach Andrew McDonald believes A rew MCDonaid beneved the biggest challenge for his side in the upcoming Border-Gavaskar Test Trophy will be to tackle "slide spin" from the Indian tweakers in the early

As the tourists got down to the business of preparing for the gruelling four-Test series beginning in Nagpur on February 9, McDonald also warned his batters that they will have to come up with individual methods and techniques to counter the sliding deliveries.

The Australians have chosen to train all by themselves instead of playing tour games as they feel practice matches serve little purpose.

Both McDonald and Steve Smith have said that serving green tops for tour games and spinning tracks for actual games defeat the very purpose of playing practice matches.

'I think the new ball is the one that creates more of that slide and when the batters do get done on the inside ... we're preparing for that (during the preparatory camp in Bengaluru)," McDonald had said before the team's departure for Bengaluru on Wednesday. On Thursday, cricket.Com.

Au re-tweeted images of the squad training at Alur, clicked by its journalist, which showed the touring party batters going about their paces in the nets.

'That slide spin, we'll expect the spinners to bowl early against our opening batters as well with the new ball so all that is taken care of in the training environment and (batting co-

"The key to success there is to have a clear method and that will be individually based and depending on the conditions we're confronted with,' McDonald was quoted as saying by Sydney Morning Herald on

McDonald said that despite the squad training on their own, there will still be variation in the track offered at Alur and the ones on which Test matches will be played, and here batters will have to use their judgement while playing shots.

"We'll be trying to make sure the batters are clear on their method," said McDonald, adding, "You're never going to get exactly the same as you're going to get in a game, and that's one of the real complexities around preparing for a cricket

The coach, who took over from Justin Langer, said another reason for not playing a tour game in India was to keep players fresh at the back end of the month-long tour.

"We haven't played a tour game, for three years. It's probably not something new to us, put it that way," McDonald said.

"We value freshness at the back end of the tour. Something we've seen teams go there before and expend a lot of energy at the

file of this group, quite an experienced group, quite an experienced batting unit as well, who have been there before, I think 11 out of the squad has been there before.

Hosts India will have the upper hand if the tracks are rank turners in the upcoming Test series but Australia will win on "fair" pitches, feels for-

mer wicketkeeper Ian Healy.
"I think if they produce fair Indian wickets, that are good batting wickets, to start with, (that) probably spin and spin pretty consistently but spin a long way, late in the match ... we (Australia) win," Healy said on 'SENQ Breakfast'.

"I'm worried about (Mitchell) Starc and (Nathan) Lyon in the first Test ... if they're unfair wickets which I've seen in the last series, where balls were jumping ridiculously and sliding down low from day one, I think India play those conditions better than us," he

Healy advised the lessexperienced Australian players to soak in the pressure and not commit any fielding lapses.

"I want the players to be very aware if they are escaping that pressure (from the locals) if you're escaping that pressure and hiding in your room using the golf simulator... I think you've got to do something

else," he said.

"That's an escape, you shouldn't be doing it, you're dodging, just be very aware of what you are feeling at any given time. Immerse yourself before you really get to deploy your technique... don't drop catches, fielding can be difficult

"What happens in India, to get ten wickets, you'll only get ten chances, whereas in Australia with bounce, carry and speed you can create 13 chances and you can waste a couple... but they don't come along as easy in India. "I just think they have to live and breathe that pressure and have a philosophy over there."

Australia haven't won a Test series in India since 2004.

been known for his batting pyrotechnics but says he has now learnt to take the back seat thing which master chaser Dhoni did in the fag end of his international career. "See, to be honest, I've

always enjoyed hitting sixes, but I have to evolve and that is life," the stand-in T20 skipper said during the press conference after India sealed the T20 series against New Zealand 2-1.

"I have to take the other part where I've always believed in partnerships. I want to give my team and the other person more calmness and the assurance that at least I'm there.

"I've played more games than any of those guys out there. So, I've known the experience and more than the experience part, it's where I've batted. and I've learnt how to accept pressure and I've learnt how to kind of swallow the pressure and kind of make sure the team and everything is calm," Hardik added.

Dhoni is known for his calm demeanour and Hardik feels now it is his responsibility to step into the legendary wicketkeeper's shoes as a batter and he is ready to sacrifice his strike-



rate to play that role.

"In that way, maybe I have to get my strike rate down or... Taking new opportunities or taking new roles is (something) I've always looked forward to. I don't mind coming in and playing the role which somewhere down the line Maahi (Dhoni)

used to play," he said.

Hardik has scored 1271 runs at a strike-rate of 142.17 in 87 T20Is.

"I think at that time, I was young, and I was hitting all around the park, but now since he has gone, all of a sudden that responsibility... It has just naturally come to me, and I don't mind (doing it). We're getting the result we want and it's okay."

During the third T20I against New Zealand, Hardik did just that, allowing the inform Shubman Gill (126) to take
