The proposed screening of the controversial BBC documentary 'India: The Modi Question' became a major flashpoint between students and the police at Jamia Millia Islamia University in the national Capital on Wednesday. The police first detained four students and later many more when the students led a protest to demand their release, the Students' Federation of India (SFI) claimed.

The students of the Punjab University also organised the screening of the BBC documentary which was stalled midway after authorities intervened. In a tweet, the Congress-affiliated students wing NSUI said "@NSUIChandigarh organised a screenplay of the BBC Modi documentary at Panjab University. The state president and many students watched the truth about

democracy killers."

The SFI's bid to screen the documentary at the Jamia campus comes a day after a similar event was organised at the Jawaharlal Nehru University during which students claimed that power and Internet were suspended and stones hurled at them. The campus witnessed heavy deployment of police and the anti-riot units Rapid Action Force (RAF) personnel.

Secretary of SFI Delhi State committee, Pritish Menon said the police detained the protesters who had gathered there.

"We were about to begin the demonstration but they were detained before that. They were taken to the police station," Menon said.

The SFI's Jamia unit had released a poster announcing that the documentary would be screened at the MCRC lawn Gate Number 8 at 6 PM.

The police said it detained four students after the SFI announced its plan.

The university administration said the screening of the controversial documentary would not be allowed.

EAM slams Pompeo over slight to Sushma

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has deplored the derisive remarks made by former US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo against Sushma Swaraj when she headed the Foreign Ministry.

Jaishankar's sharp reaction came a day after Tuesday's launch of Mike Pompeo's book in which he made disparaging references about the late Swaraj. Writing about Swaraj, Pompeo said he never saw his counterpart Swaraj as an "important political player" but got along famously with S Jaishankar. "I have seen a passage in Secretary Pompeo's book refer-



ring to Smt Sushma Swaraj ji. I always held her in great esteem and had an exceptionally close and warm relationship with her. I deplore the disrespectful colloquialism used for her," Jaishankar said. In his latest book 'Never Give an Inch: Fighting for the America I Love' that hit the

stores on Tuesday, Pompeo describes Swaraj somewhat disparagingly, using the American slang words 'goof-ball' and 'heartland political hack' for her. Swaraj served as the External Affairs Minister from May 2014 to May 2019. She died in August 2019.

'India-Pak came
close to N-war
after Balakot strike'

WASHINGTON: Former US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo wrote in his book that India and Pakistan came close to nuclear war in 2019 after the Balakot strike and that US intervention prevented escalation. "I do not think the world properly knows just how close the India-Pakistan rivalry came to spilling over into a nuclear conflagration in February 2019," the likely future presidential contender wrote in his memoirs of his time as Donald Trump's top diplomat and earlier CIA chief.

'India seen with new
respect on global stage'

In her maiden Address to the Nation on the eve of Republic Day, President Droupadi Murmu on Wednesday said India is now being seen with "new respect" on the global stage.

She lauded the linguistic diversity of the country, founders of the Constitution for giving a moral framework, and commended the roles of farmers, workers, scientists and engineers whose



combined strength enables India to live up to the spirit of "Jai Jawan, Jai Kisan, Jai Vigyan, Jai Anusandhan".

Asserting that the world looked at India now with a "new respect", she pointed to the country's leadership

of G20 and said it was an ideal platform to discuss and find solutions to "most pressing" problems such as global warming and climate change that were affecting the poor the most. The President said after a series of initiatives in recent years to transform all aspects of governance and unleash the creative energies of the people, the world has started to look at India with a new sense of respect.

Telangana's spiritual gurus Swami Chinna Jeeyar Kamlesh D Patel and writer and educationist Kapil Kapoor from Delhi as well, and singer Suman Kalyapoor from Maharashtra were also awarded Padma Bhushan.

Haryana raises sugarcane price to Rs 372 per quintal

Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar on Wednesday announced a Rs 10 per quintal hike in sugarcane price, raising the crop's rate to Rs 372 a quintal. The new price will come into force from the current crushing season.

Khattar said that safeguarding the interest of farmers is the utmost priority of the state government.

"I urge the farmers that the prices have been hiked and now they should bring their sugarcane to the mills so the mills can run smoothly. Closure of sugar mills is neither in the interest of the farmers nor of the mills," he said.

Crushing at sugar mills had recently come to a halt as protesting farmers had stopped the supply of sugarcane by locking the main entrances of the fourteen mills in the state. The farmers had been demanding a hike in the sugarcane's state-advised price from Rs 362 to Rs 450 per quintal.

The Chief Minister said though the current sugar price



has not increased as expected, Haryana is giving high prices in comparison to other states. He said that the opposition and some farmer unions were doing politics on this issue (on the cane price issue), which is not fair. Farmers also understand today that the sugar mills are running at a loss and despite this, the government is taking decisions in the interest of the farmers, he said.

An official statement said at present the sugar mills of the state are facing a loss of Rs 5,293 crore. The percentage of

sugar recovery in the cooperative mills is 9.75 percent while the percentage of private mills is 10.24 percent, he said. He further said that to increase the sugar recovery and make the mills financially stable, the capacity of cooperative sugar mills is being increased along with setting up ethanol and energy plants. Besides this, the renovation of mills has been done. Khattar said that a committee was earlier constituted under the chairmanship of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister J P Dalal and

after considering the demands of the sugarcane farmers the committee submitted its report. The committee held several meetings with the farmers, cooperative department, private mills, and subject experts and recommended the hike, along with other important recommendations, he said.

The chief minister said timely payment to sugarcane farmers has been assured. A total of Rs 2,628 crore has been paid in the year 2020-21, hence there is no pendency for this year. He said that directions have been issued to the cooperative sugar mills to make payment to the farmers within a week. Farmers have also been offered that if they wish to run the sugar mills, the government can also consider this.

Meanwhile, the chief minister said that due to intense cold weather conditions, the mustard crop has been damaged. Regular Girdawari (revenue survey) will be started from February 5 to assess the damage and farmers will be given compensation for the damage.

Signs of fissures appear within AAP with MLA raising banner of revolt

First signs of fissures within the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) appeared on Wednesday with its legislator and former IPS officer Kunwar Vijay Partap Singh raising a banner of revolt against his own party's government for slow pedaling in sacrilege cases.

A cop-turned-politician, who had in the past expressed his displeasure over the government's inaction in 2015 sacrilege cases on several occasions, on Wednesday resigned "in protest" from the post of chairman of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha's Committee on Government Assurances.

It has been learnt that Kunwar Vijay, AAP MLA from Amritsar (North), put in his papers following his differences with the government on handling the probe into the cases. Notably, the former Inspector General of Police had also resigned from the state police force over the same issue.

MLA from Amritsar North



segment, Kunwar Vijay has sent his resignation letter to Speaker Kultar Singh Sandhwan through e-mail. However, the Speaker is yet to accept the resignation, till the filing of this report.

As per the information available, Kunwar Vijay had convened a meeting of the House Committee on January 20 on the sacrilege cases probe, in which the Chief Secretary VK Janjua and Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav were summoned. However, on the same day and same time, the Speaker Sandhwan called a meeting of

all House committee chairmen, following which Kunwar Vijay had to cancel his meeting.

Former cop's resentment against his own party's government can also be attributed to the non-serious attitude displayed by the AAP government, in these past months over the sensitive issue of sac-

rilege. During the assembly sessions, Kunwar Vijay had sought a long discussion regarding the investigation into the sacrilege cases. He had, in fact, urged the Speaker to dedicate a day for the discussion. However, nothing was done.

Before joining politics, Kunwar Vijay, as IGP, was heading the Special Investigation Team (SIT) probing the 2015 Kotakpura and Behbal Kalan police firing cases. The incidents had taken place after the alleged desecration of a religious text in Faridkot.

The 1998-batch officer of the Punjab cadre had resigned in the run-up to the assembly elections after the Punjab and Haryana High Court quashed the probe by the SIT into the Kotkapura firing incident.

BAJWA EXTENDS SUPPORTS

Coming openly in support of AAP MLA from Amritsar (North) Kunwar Vijay Pratap, senior Congress leader and the Leader of Opposition in Vidhan Sabha Partap Singh Bajwa on Wednesday strongly condemned the AAP Government for poor handling of the issues relating to sacrilege of Sri Guru Granth Sahib and alleged police firing in which two Sikh youth were killed. "Kunwar Vijay Pratap Singh had rightfully criticized his government on various occasions. He had also demanded a special session of the Vidhan Sabha to debate the sacrilege and police firing incidents. During the budget session in June, Kunwar Vijay had also moved a call attention notice on the issue but it was not taken up," he said.

Three Punjab cops to get President medal for distinguished service, 15 for meritorious service

Centre has ignored Punjab's sacrifice in freedom struggle, says CM Mann

Non-Inclusion of Punjab Tableau in R-Day Parade

Breaking his silence over the controversy that erupted after the non-inclusion of Punjab's tableau in the Republic Day parade at New Delhi, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Wednesday said that the state's sacrifices in the freedom struggle were ignored when the Centre rejected its tableau. Slamming the BJP Government at the Centre for the same, Mann said that this "anti-Punjab" stance of the Union Government is unwarranted and undesirable. "Every year, Republic Day parade celebrations include a spectacular ceremonial parade, which is a tribute to India, its unity in diversity, and its rich cultural heritage through various states' tableaux. The state of Punjab has also been regularly featuring in the tableau parade showcasing the critical importance of this border state with its rich history, colourful and vibrant culture, and pivotal point for

defining events which shaped the history of the great nation," said Mann. He added, "It is a matter of great disappointment that this year, despite the presentation of ideas to the selection committee on important themes like Watan Ke Rakhwale - emphasizing the significant role of Punjab in India's military might and annadats; Nari Shakti - through the valour of Mai Bhago ji; and the revered events in history of freedom struggle along with tales of bravery and supreme sacrifices through Battle of Saragarhi, Punjab's tableau has not been selected for the Republic Day parade."

The Chief Minister said that though the selection committee even appreciated the ideas, it is disheartening that the people of this great country along with the whole world will be bereft from the rich cultural and historical tribute, which Punjab will have showcased. "Punjabis had made enormous sacrifices to free our motherland from its yoke of British imperialism.

Despite of being merely two percent of the country's population, 80 percent of the martyrs, either executed or exiled during the freedom movement, were Punjabis," he added.

The Chief Minister said that even after independence, the Punjabis have been

instrumental in the prosperity and overall development of the country besides safeguarding the borders of the nation from external aggressions. "The State Government wanted to showcase this stellar role of Punjabis in the freedom struggle through the tableau," said Mann, bemoaning that the Union Government had hatched a conspiracy by not allowing Punjab to showcase its achievements to the world.

The Chief Minister lamented that though the country is celebrating 75th year of its independence, "due to reasons best known to them, the Union Government is skeptical of those patriots who have steered the country to freedom."

This reflects the BJP-led Government's myopic mindset...BJP Government is probably hesitant to reflect Punjab's contribution in the national freedom struggle. Pointing out, he said: "It is ironical that only BJP-ruled states have been allowed to participate in the Republic Day parade from North India. The non-BJP ruled states, especially Punjab and Delhi, have been deliberately kept out of the parade by the BJP." "This type of discriminatory treatment with Punjab and Punjabis is highly condemnable and intolerable," he added.

Himachal CM Sukhu resolves to state corruption-free, put economy back on rails

PUNJAB ON THRESHOLD FOR REJUVENATING HEALTH, EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT

Today is day of elation and rejoicing for all of us as it was on this historic day in 1950 that India became a Sovereign, Socialist, Democratic, Secular Republic and millions of us got the power to exercise our franchise thereby fulfilling the cherished aspirations of our forefathers of having the "Government of the people, for the people and by the people".

The drafting committee of our constitution led by Dr BR Ambedkar empowered hundreds of thousands of our disadvantaged and underprivileged brethren by giving them the right to vote, which was a distant dream for them, till then. The dream envisaged by our founding forefathers of an Independent and sovereign Indian Republic was realized on this momentous day. Taking inspiration from the great leaders of our national freedom struggle our government is committed for realizing their dreams.

Due to strenuous efforts of the state government, Punjab is on the threshold of witnessing revolutionary changes in the Education, Employment and Health sectors in the current year. Education, Health and Employment sectors are three important pillars of our society but unfortunately these areas had hitherto remained ignored during the tenure of successive state governments. However, now after assuming charge of office, my government is laying major thrust on development of these areas of immense public importance.

During the current year the state government will rejuvenate these sectors to ensure their benefit the people. Top priority is being accorded on these sectors to ensure that more and more people takes mileage from it. No stone will be left unturned for this noble cause as these sectors are directly connected with welfare of people and the current year will witness major changes in these three areas.

Going down the memory lane there are countless tales of enormous sacrifices made by our countrymen during their relentless struggle against the mighty British Raj to free our motherland from its yoke of imperialism. None can ever forget the unprecedented sacrifices made by the Punjabis at the altar of the Indian National

freedom struggle. There is hardly any denial to the fact that Punjabis not only played a vanguard role in the national freedom struggle but their deeds of exemplary valor inspired millions of others to join the 'war for independence'.

Despite of being merely two percent of the country's population 80% of the martyrs either executed or exiled during the freedom movement were Punjabis. Punjab- the har-binger of several watershed movements of Indian freedom struggle produced sons of the soil like Lala Lajpat Rai, Diwaan Singh Kalepani and others who laid their lives for emancipating the country from the clutches of British Colonialism. The heroic deeds of Shaheed Bhagat Singh, Shaheed Rajguru, Shaheed Sukhdev, Shaheed Udhram Singh, Shaheed Madan Lal Dhillon and Kartar Singh Sarabha gave new vigor to the national freedom struggle by inspiring the generations to rise against the mighty British rule. Likewise, the brutal killing of innocent people in the Jallian-wala Bagh Massacre proved to be the last nail in the coffin of the barbaric British rule.

Even after independence the Punjabis have been instrumental in the prosperity and overall development of the country besides safeguarding the borders of the nation from the external aggressions. We have always stood firmly to uphold the ethos of democracy by reposing complete faith and confidence in the constitution of the nation. Notwithstanding our limited natural resources, the Punjabi farmers have put their sweat and toil to make the country self reliant in food production, that too at the cost of overexploitation of the only available natural resources of the state in terms of soil and water.

Likewise, the brave Punjabi soldiers upheld the glorious tradition of defending their motherland and the numerous sacrifices made by them in the battles of 1947, 1962, 1965, 1971 and most recently in the Kargil War besides a number of other operations to maintain peace, law and order in the country were testimony to it. But unfortunately, Punjab itself had lagged behind in the process of development due to the callousness of successive state governments. This has forced us to relook into the elements required for giving a boost to the overall development of the state and prosperity of its people.

My government is working closely with the people and in unison with the ideals of Shaheed Bhagat Singh and Baba Sahib Dr BR Ambedkar, to achieve these goals. The Aam Aadmi Government has already taken several path breaking initiatives to ensure progress of the state and prosperity of its people.

In order to provide quality and timely health services to the people, our government has dedicated 75 Aam Aadmi clinics to mark 75th Independence Day and currently 100

Aam Aadmi Clinics are operational in state. These clinics are offering 41 health packages with nearly 100 clinical tests free of cost to the people. Our government will be dedicating more than 400 such additional clinics on January 27th which will act as the cornerstone in the revamp of the healthcare system in Punjab.

As Education is bedrock for building a new society, so we have introduced Multi-pronged improvements in the education sector for transforming Government schools into 'Schools of Eminence'. Punjab government will soon open 100 Schools of Eminence to provide international standard education to the students. A state of the art International Education Affairs Cell (International Education Affairs Cell) has been established to provide international level training to school education administrators, school heads and teachers working in Education department.

In another path breaking initiative it has been decided to name the government schools of Punjab after freedom fighters, great personalities and martyrs. Likewise, strenuous efforts are being made to upgrade the infrastructure and manpower in the government schools across the state to impart quality education to the students. Notification has been issued for regularization of contractual teachers and portal for same has been started to do further process.

The state government has regularized the services of 8736 Contract Teachers regularized and process is on to regularize 28000 more contractual employees. For the first time the state government has given job letters to 25886 youth in various departments merely in first 10 months of its tenure. Process of filling 2100 posts in Punjab Police has been issued and it has been decided to fill 1800 posts of Constables and 300 Sub-inspectors every year in coming four years. In a major employee friendly decision the Old Pension Scheme for government employees has been notified.

In a major push to Medical education in Punjab, my government has decided to construct 16 new Medical colleges in the coming five years that will enhance the total tally of medical colleges in the state to 25 thereby ensuring that every district of the state touches a medical college. The work on Kapurthala and Hoshiarpur medical colleges has already commenced whereas that on Sant Atar Singh Mastuana Medical College in Sangrur will start soon. On the one hand it will help in providing quality medical education to the students and on other hand it will help in imparting world class healthcare facilities to people.

Corruption free governance is at the core of the ethos of the state government, which has been duly proved in its actions from day one. Anti-corruption helpline was launched within the first few days of forming

the government and till now 57 FIRs Registered on the basis of Complaints received, 76 persons have been arrested so far. Similarly Vigilance Bureau has arrested 172 persons involved in corruption.

In a major citizen centric decision, my government has decided to give 600 units free per household in every billing cycle from July after which 90% consumers are getting zero power bills now. The state government has waived off all pending bills up to December 31, 2021 in addition to all those which have bills not paid up to June 30, 2022. My government has also reduced Tube-wells load enhancement fees reduced from Rs. 4750/hp to Rs. 2500/hp; 1,87,000 thereby immensely benefitting the farmers.

State has taken leap towards being power surplus after the resuming of coal supply from Pachwara mine. This will ensure that none of the Thermal Power plants will face any sort of coal shortage in the state. No power cut has been imposed in state during previous paddy season as Punjab produced 83 percent more power from previous years.

Punjab has taken a major citizen centric decision by launching 128 new services in Sewa Kendras and extending their timings besides making them operational even on weekends. Path breaking initiatives like E-learners License for Citizens, presentation of first ever Paperless Budget, in-

troduction of e-stamp papers, launching of Mutual Land Partition portal and delivery of Registration certificate of vehicles at door steps of people has immensely benefitted the masses.

In order to channelize unbounded energy of youth in state by promoting sports culture, the state government has organized "Khedan Watan Punjab Diyan" in which around three lakh players participated in various events from block to state level. To encourage our players bringing laurels for the state and country Rs. 9.30 crore cash award was given to Commonwealth Games medalists. We have decided to re-introduce Shaheed-E-Azam Bhagat Singh State Youth Awards in which two youth from each District will be selected for this award and felicitated with an amount of Rs. 51,000, medal and certificate.

Punjab government is committed for emerging Punjab as the most preferred industrial destination across the country. Due to strenuous efforts of the state government investment worth Rs. 27000 Crore has been firmed up in Punjab thereby creating 1.25 lakh jobs for youth. In a big boost to industrial activity, the Tata group has decided to set up scrap based steel plant in the state worth Rs. 2600 crore.

Likewise, India's largest Compressed Biogas Project has been set up in Sangrur to fight Stubble Burning menace

and produce renewable energy. In order to further boost industrialization in the state the draft of New Industrial and Business Development Policy 2022 has been introduced and views have been solicited from various stakeholders. Similarly, single window hassle free investment facilitation system has been introduced to benefit the prospective investors. The Punjab government is organizing the Progressive Punjab Investors' Summit scheduled for February 23-24 to give further boost to investment.

Elected representatives of the people have the responsibility to set an example of an exemplary public life and to ensure that there is no wastage of public money. Moving in this direction, the state government has notified the 'Single Pension for MLA' bill which stipulates that each MLA will get only a single pension, instead of the earlier provision of permitting multiple pensions for every term.

For first time ever direct government AC Volvo buses have been started from Punjab to Delhi Airport. The fare of state of the art luxury buses are 50% cheaper and they provide more facilities and comfort than private buses.

As a humble tribute to the brave soldiers who lay down their lives while safeguarding the borders of the country and maintaining law and order,

the state government has enhanced honorarium given to the families of martyred soldiers to Rs. 1 Crore.

In order to enhance the green cover in the state Shaheed Bhagat Singh Hari-awal Lehar was started during which 1.12 Crore saplings were planted. The state government has also enhanced Minimum wages of Labour and Construction Workers. Tax has been waived off for all vehicles carrying religious scriptures across the state.

As a mark of tribute to the iconic martyr Shaheed Bhagat Singh, Mohali International Airport has been named as Shaheed Bhagat Singh International Airport. To promote dairy farming sector Milk Procurement price increased by Rs. 70/- per kg milk fat i.e. from Rs. 700 per kg to Rs. 770 per kg and new milk processing milk plants along with capacity enhancements is being done in Ludhiana, Ferozepur and Jalandhar. The state government has started a massive drive for removal of Encroachments on Panchayat Lands and 9389 Acres have been freed so far and taken possession.

Agriculture is set for a revamp in Punjab as several measures are being introduced to make it profitable and sustainable. Moong has been promoted as the third crop and the crop was procured at the MSP of Rs 7275/- per quintal, yielding an additional income of Rs 30000/- per acre. As a result, area under summer Moong

doubled from 54,363 acres to 1,28,495 acres.



The government is working to encourage diversification of more crops such as pulses, maize, cotton and oilseeds by making their cultivation remunerative. Subsidy worth Rs 1500 per acre has been provided for Direct Seeding of Rice- another landmark initiative of the government to save water. We are happy see that 25,985 farmers have sown paddy via DSR last year.

Adopting a zero tolerance policy towards organised crime, my government has launched a war against activities of gangsters in the state for which an Anti-Gangster Task Force headed by an ADGP Rank officer has been set up. In line with its core commitment to eliminate drugs from Punjab, the state government is waging an all out war against the menace. Police has been directed not to spare anyone conniving with the Drug Mafia.

On this momentous occasion, let us rededicate ourselves to cement the bonds of love, peace and communal harmony enshrined by our great Gurus, saints and seers to fulfil the vision of our freedom fighters and national heroes.

I call upon all Punjabis to play an active role in the journey to realise the dream of building 'Rangla' Punjab'. I am hopeful that together we will once again make Punjab prosperous and a front runner state of the country.

Window of opportunity

India has invited Pakistan Foreign Minister for SCO meeting may not result may break the ice

India inviting Pakistan Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari and Chief Justice Umar Atta Bandial for the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) meeting in Goa has hit the headlines. The SCO Foreign Ministers' meeting is likely to be held in the first week of May. Though officials have made it clear that the invitation sent to Bhutto Zardari is a "routine matter" as India is the current chair of SCO, it has attracted considerable interest. This is mainly because of Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's recent conciliatory remarks vis-à-vis India and his desire to hold talks with India. He said that he had asked the United Arab Emirates (UAE) to facilitate the negotiations. The Pakistan Prime Minister's Office later brought in a caveat—that India must restore Jammu and Kashmir's special status—but it is widely believed that this was the result of the intervention of the deep state. It is a well-known fact that the Pakistani deep state remains wedded to the jihadist ideal of destroying India. A lot many factors ensure that the ideal is poignantly felt and zealously acted upon: revenge for the defeat in the 1971 Indo-Pak War, resulting in an inglorious surrender and dismemberment of the nation; Islamisation, which began under Zia-ul-Haq in the 1980s, and gained depth and breadth in Pakistani society and culture subsequently; birth and development of the terror factory with its various stakeholders entrenched in the Army, government, society, culture, and civil society. Even the



Oxford-educated Imran Khan ended up with the sobriquet 'Taliban Khan.' In such a socio-cultural milieu, it will always be difficult to even find, let alone have dialogue with, people in the Pakistani establishment who are sensible enough to talk sense and courageous enough to walk the talk.

Such is the climate of opinion that anything reasonable attracts flak and obnoxious gets applause. Unsurprisingly, Pakistani leaders regularly indulge in loose talk and make deplorable remarks. Last month, for instance, Bilawal Bhutto called Prime Minister Narendra Modi "the butcher of Gujarat." This is not how foreign ministers talk about the heads of governments of other countries. But then in Pakistan politicians are always mindful of the reaction of the all-powerful Army, which carries out coups, installs and deposes governments. Imran Khan's rise and fall are examples of generals' intervention; they ensured that he won the election and, when he became defiant, kicked him out of power. Pakistani politicians' plight is best summarized in an old Hindi film song by Mukesh: Mujhe raat din yeh khyal hai, kahin woh nazar se gira na de... Therefore, to expect that the visit of Bilawal Bhutto (if it happens, for Islamabad may decide to send the junior foreign minister) would result in a thaw in the bilateral relations would be excessive optimism. Yet, the visit does open a window of opportunity for both nations to have meaningful dialogue.

Kerala govt's U-turn

Despite Centre's rejection the Kerala govt wants to go ahead with the controversial Silver Line project

The Kerala Government which called off the Semi High Speed Silver Line Rail Project connecting Kasaragod in the north and Thiruvananthapuram in the south has made a U-turn from its earlier stance and has decided to approach the Centre for permission for the controversial rail route which generated massive protests across the State. While delivering the customary address to the first session of this year's Legislative Assembly on Monday, Governor Arif Mohammed Khan announced that the Detailed Project Report of Silver Line has been approved by the State Government and submitted to the Ministry of Railways for final approval. But what he did not tell in the speech was the Centre's rejection of the proposal citing issues like ecology, environment and apprehension expressed by the public. The State administration loses nothing if it sees the writing on the wall and calls off the project which has drawn widespread public ire and resistance from thousands of people who would be shunted out of their homes and farm lands for acquisition of land. The Governor's announcement that the State Government would bid seriously for the Angamali-Sabari Rail Project.



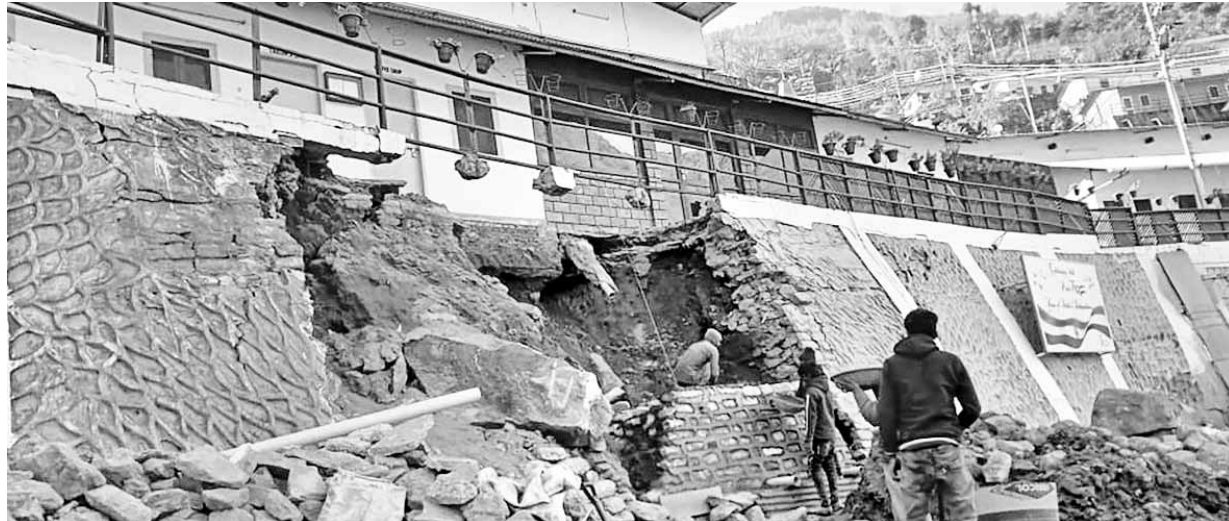
The move to go ahead with the Angamali-Sabari Rail Project for the benefit of Lord Ayyappa devotees is a retrograde and regressive measures. Hundreds of people were shocked by the announcement because the State Government has not acquired the land for the implementation of the Railway Line except installing stones along the proposed route and that too without the permission of the land owners. A cabal consisting of railway contractors, land sharks and drug peddlers are reportedly behind the initiative to lay the Sabari rail track to ensure the illegal traffic of high quality marijuana cultivated in the dense forests of the Western Ghats to the outside world, according to B V Kumar, who headed the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence for years and had led many operations against drug traffickers. The Kerala Government has failed time and again to focus on infrastructure projects which are essential for the State's development. Rail journey in the State is a harrowing experience as most of the services between Thiruvananthapuram and Kasaragod are delayed by hours because of outdated signal system and worn-out tracks. The Governor's speech stands out for its rhetoric and absence of concrete proposals. The CPI(M) has disappointed the electorate which re-elected the party to power. People in the State need a better deal.

Unearthing the root of the disaster

If plundering of hill is not stopped, disasters like in Joshimath are bound to happen in the fragile ecosystem of the lower Himalayas.

The fragile Himalayan mountains of Uttarakhand in the town of Joshimath in Chamoli district, located at an altitude of 6,150 feet, is famous as a gateway to Badrinath, one of the holy shrines 'Char Dhams' as well as the Sikh pilgrimage center at Hemkund Sahib, skiing attraction of Auli and the 'Valley of Flowers' UNESCO World Heritage site, is in news for wrong reasons - it is sinking rapidly all due to human-induced causes. On January 11, 2023, 723 houses in all the nine wards of the town had developed major or minor cracks on the floors, ceilings, and walls. Consequently, 145 families have been moved to safer locations. Joshimath has a population of 23,000 and is heavily built, with hotels, resorts, and a busy market catering to tourists, pilgrims, trekkers, and army and Indo-Tibetan border Police (ITBP) personnel. It emerged as a place of strategic importance in 1962 because it leads to villages along the Indo-China border and falls en route to Barahoti, a disputed territory along the border.

As per surveys conducted by experts, Joshimath falls in Zone V, India's highest-risk seismic zonation scheme and situated between two thrusts, the Main Central Thrust (MCT) and the Vaikrita Thrust (VT) and occupies a seismically active terrain. The town is highly active in terms of slope mobility because it is built on the deposits of an old landslide which means that the slopes can be destabilized even by slight triggers. Climatically, it lies in a region that frequently receives high-intensity, focussed rainfall, is prone to extreme weather, and could trigger landslides because the slopes are precariously balanced. Alarm bells in the region had begun ringing about five decades back when it was part of erstwhile Uttar Pradesh when the government constituted a committee led by the then Garhwal Commissioner, Mahesh Chander Mishra to investigate the cause of land subsidence in the area. The committee's report of 1976 warned against heavy and unscientific construction in the town.



It was clearly indicated that "Joshimath is a deposit of sand and stone.....hence was not a suitable place for the coming up of a township. Vibrations produced by blasting and heaving traffic will also lead to disequilibrium in natural factors". Subsequently, several studies flagged similar concerns, but the alarm bells went unheard and timely warnings were ignored.

In fact, on the contrary, Joshimath continued to develop exactly against the way the Mishra committee had advised. Successive governments, however, have sanctioned bigger projects - highways, hydropower, infrastructure development, and hazardous development of townships with no regard for environmental fallout. As normally attributed, the local people and climate change are responsible for the disasters. However, in his case, the policy-led disasters are "Made in Delhi". This is apparent from the decision of sanctioning large hydropower projects by the Centre even after the 2013 Kedarnath tragedy. The armed forces and the state and local authorities, in their overenthusiasm, to have a smoother, faster, all-weather connectivity for pilgrims, and tourists, ignored the government's own recommended "best practices norms" The construction of highways and railway tracks

HC's judgement on abortion



The Bombay High court had delivered a landmark decision on termination of pregnancy and allowed a pregnant lady to terminate in 32 weeks treating in violation of individual liberty which has been exercised by every individual. Court had said that it would be a denial of the woman's right to dignity and her reproductive and decisional autonomy if she is not allowed to undergo medical termination of the foetus with serious abnormalities and "the decision is hers and hers alone to make, once the conditions in the statute are met. The right to choose is the mothers'. A medical board was constituted as required by the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act. The medical opinion confirmed the diagnosis of anomalies and added the possibility of intel-

lectual disability to the child but said both conditions were not life-threatening. It denied the request for a medical termination of pregnancy in view of the advanced gestation period.

The woman, however, said she comes from a humble background and will not be able to provide additional care and meet the expenses of an infant born with such conditions and urged the court to intervene. The court then directed a qualified psychiatrist to assess whether a medical termination of the pregnancy at this stage would pose a physical or mental risk to the woman. The report stated that she has no major medical, obstetric, or psychiatric complications at present but considering the advanced gestational age the medical termination of pregnancy is not recommended. However, Advocate in the court pointed out that the Act does not say what is to happen if a fetal abnormality is detected late in the pregnancy and that the writ jurisdiction of the Court may be invoked. The court on January 20 allowed the termination of the pregnancy. These important decisions should be highlighted by the concerned general public.

also believed to have disturbed the mountain's foundation.

Similar sentiments are echoed by the members of Joshimath Bacho Sangharsh Samiti, which have been protesting against projects detrimental to Joshimath since 2004 and are currently leading protests demanding adequate relief and rehabilitation for Joshimath's residents whose houses have been damaged. They felt that water released in 2009 is a major contributor to the subsistence and the water laden with muck and some volatile chemicals, began surfacing in the town's Marwari from the February 7, 2021 flood that would have entered into the (under construction) tunnel of the Tapovan Vishnugad project and is now surfacing in Joshimath. However, there have been no scientific studies establishing links between the puncture and the subsidence in Joshimath. Refuting these allegations, the NTPC has denied any role in the ongoing crisis. The real cause of this disaster remains a sort of mystery for the authorities as well as the public.

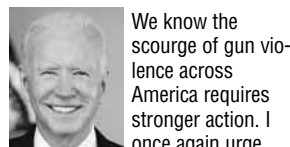

IT IS EASIER TO LIVE IN DENIAL OF REALITY

But the lesson of Gita is that we should accept reality

One must wonder as to why we do not want to accept reality. Why do the majority of us want to live in denial? Because it is difficult; it is easier to live in denial. It wasn't so, it would not have taken Lord Krishna to speak the entire Gita to convince Arjuna, who accepted what the Lord wanted him to do only in verse #18.73. What was Arjuna's initial position? He didn't want to fight the inevitable war, and he gave many reasons for it. Sample some of his arguments. Arjuna didn't see the opposition Army consisting of persons who were bent upon perpetrating 'adharma' (injustice) as what they were; he saw them as relatives.(1.28) He could see only adverse consequences, nothing favourable in killing them.(1.31) He would rather die than desire either victory, kingdom or pleasures.(1.32) He was strongly of the opinion that it would be sinful to kill his relatives.(1.36) Arjuna even foresaw sacrosanct family values getting destroyed, predominance of immortality, women of the family getting corrupted resulting in illicit progeny, etc. Such an act by him was surely going to result in a long stay of hell for his side. (1.44)

How did Lord Krishna manage to bring Arjuna around to see the reality? The Lord started with the knowledge of soul, while Arjuna was seeing only material bodies. This is what most of us do too. We don't want to accept the reality of previous lives, future lives, etc. For the ignorant mass, the present life is everything. This wrong perception prevents us from seeing the truth of our existence.



We don't believe in the 'Karmaphala Principle', which is crucial for accepting reality, the system of reward and punishment, which is fate. Once we accept the reality of the soul, we begin to accept death – the most painful reality. This is where actual realism comes.

The next reality is being dutiful. Even animals are dutiful towards their progeny. We cannot be worse than them. We must accept to do whatever is necessary according to time, place and circumstances. If we are mentally prepared to do that, life becomes more meaningful. Because as human beings, being dutiful is the foremost requirement. These duties are towards ourselves, our families, our professions, etc.

We, being small, are incomplete in every sense; we need God's help 24x7. A good connection with God makes us complete, we being parts of Him. (15.7) Then nothing is beyond us. We can accept whatever the realities of our lives.

We just have to accept to be good in all respects, which happens by embracing the mode of goodness in all our activities, as detailed by Lord Krishna in the Gita. Gradually, we will become habituated to accept the ups and downs of life. (2.14) Acceptance makes living easy. It shows faith and hope for the future. Will we then be ready to accept what we must and go on steadily ahead? Those who can live their lives in the way explained by Lord Krishna in the Gita can look forward to a quality life, notwithstanding challenges, which loom ahead.

paths determined by how you can make a difference to your family, to society and to the world at large. Lacking clarity about one's interest areas, aptitude, work preferences, etc. and having a negative self-image could substantially increase the magnitude of stress and anxiety experienced by the students.

Swami Vivekananda exhorted us, "...each soul is a manifestation of divinity. If you have faith in all the Gods...and still have no faith in yourselves, there is no salvation for you." Thus, self-awareness is crucial, leading to identification of both strengths and weaknesses and resulting in increased confidence. This is why it is critical not simply to have a positive outlook, but rather to consciously weed out the negativity in our lives – negative thoughts, negative friends, negative information, etc. Negativity should not be removed by a false sense of superiority but by acknowledging that even our smallest strengths can help in different situations.

Life is a series of new experiences, environments, people, it is multi-faceted and a journey with many infinite destinations and possibilities. But everyone approaches it in a different way. While some are stifled by choices, others are overwhelmed by choices. At another end of the spectrum, some do not even know enough about the choices at hand. Lack of accurate understanding about numerous career options is another issue that stresses out students. This includes diverse work profiles, pay scales, potential for growth, future of certain industries, etc. One can make an informed choice only when they have all the required information. In such a case, not having access to information or consuming content from unreliable sources (eg. making a career decision based on a random conversation with a friend) could prove to be quite harmful in these circumstances.

In Exam Warriors, PM has written, "Create your own opportunities. Be the master of your destiny. Today, there are tremendous opportunities in fields which were unimaginable even a decade ago. When you make these choices, remember your passion makes for the best vocation."

With these words as a foundation, practically, at the individual level, students can focus more of their time and energy in seeking information, having healthy conversations with friends, family, teachers, and resource persons. The cohort of adults in a child's environment can assist the students by encouraging open communication. They can guide, without being judgmental or forcing their opinions on children, and help children make decisions and become independent while selecting their subjects, colleges and universities.

Having an adult to speak with or discuss their career concerns or to ask questions and have constructive discussions could be significantly important for teenagers deliberating about their future.

Parents and teachers can also help the children by removing the taboo of going to a counselor and seeking professional help, if the need be. Having proper meetings with the parents, teacher and the child present would also be beneficial in discussing the concerns each of them might have, even concerns about resources, and come up with feasible solutions accordingly.

Such discussions could foster an environment of support, and understanding for the student. It is of utmost importance for the students to know that they are not alone in this journey, and that they will be able to figure things out gradually.

Lacking important life skills like time management, goal setting, etc., could further deteriorate their academic situation, and the student might start feeling incompetent leading to a negative self-image.

During PPC, PM Modi counseled students, "Every individual is blessed with unique abilities. These abilities are best channelled through quality time management. So, time management is nothing but ability management."

Life skills are built by taking constant care of yourself, mentally, physically and emotionally. The Prime Minister has said that "practising yoga with full awareness is the most effective way to achieve holistic development of the self.....one who plays, shines." India should win war against cervical cancer fast

The necessary tools to stop this preventable disease and eliminate it completely are available

Third Front again! Before every Lok Sabha poll, the Third Front idea is floated, and the 2024 polls are no exception. Political pundits predict that there is space for the entire Opposition against Bharatiya Janata Party but not a Third Front, as it will splinter the anti-BJP votes and help the ruling dispensation. The concept was tried and tested in 1977, 1989, and 1996-98, supported by either Congress or the BJP. But they were all short-lived.

A recent tweet by the Union Minister of Health & Family Welfare highlighted a new milestone achieved by India in securing the health of new mothers in the country. Sustained systemic efforts over a decade and targeted health initiatives have helped India

bring down the number of maternal deaths per 100,000 live births or the Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) from 130 in 2014-2016 to 97 in 2018-2020.

A decade back, deaths due to cancer of the uterine cervix and maternal deaths were both pegged at around 72,000 per year. However, cancer cervix has rapidly surpassed maternal mortality and has become the second common cause of cancer deaths amongst women in India. This is a distressing sign for a life-threatening disease that is almost entirely preventable. In 2020, over 120,000 women in India were reported to have cancer of the cervix, resulting in more than 77,000 deaths. Human Papilloma virus (HPV) has been established as a cause of cancer of

the cervix. More than 90 per cent of cancer cervix cases are due to high-risk HPV type. HPV, much like the influenza virus, is a ubiquitous virus and can enter the body through small abrasions in the skin and mucosa.

While most low-grade infections spontaneously resolve within two years, persistent infection results in cancer of the cervix. Early cancer can be completely asymptomatic. Hence, we may not know when a woman will develop pre-invasive or invasive cancer and a woman could be harboring a cancer for several years only discovering it at an advanced stage. Symptoms usually include irregular vaginal bleeding, post-coital vaginal bleeding and sometimes between men-

strual cycles.

Invasive cancer of the cervix can cause a foul-smelling vaginal discharge or pelvic pain and is undeniably the most dreaded form when it invades adjacent organs like the bladder and rectum.

Beyond mortality, the long-term effects of cervical cancer can severely impact the quality of life. In addition to undergoing the harrowing experience of cancer treatment and associated toxicities, cancer survivors also have to battle with long term issues such as menopausal symptoms, severe leg swelling (lower limb lymphedema), sexual dysfunction, infertility, social judgement and rejection, difficulty in social functioning, reduced self-esteem, negative body image, as well as finan-

cial issues.

Unfortunately, this cancer is mostly diagnosed in young women between 35 to 45 years of age when they are in the prime years. Only silver line is that the cancer of the cervix is almost entirely preventable. We know that it is caused by a virus and that there are effective vaccines already used globally to help prevent it. Vaccinating young girls long before they are exposed to this virus can aid primary prevention. Regular screening after the age of 30 and effective treatment through surgery or radiation, can eliminate what currently stands as the second most common cancer in women in India. Advocating the vaccine to every young girl between the age of 9-14, that they see

in their practice, and advising screening of women between 30-49 years with a high precision HPV DNA test will be the two strongest pillars in this fight against cancer cervix.

As a member of the World Health Assembly, India committed to WHO's Global Cervical Cancer Elimination Initiative to accelerate the elimination of cancer of the cervix by 2030. The 90-70-90 target set by the initiative requires 90 per cent of girls to be fully vaccinated with HPV vaccine before the age of 15, 70 per cent of women to be screened with a high-performance test by the age of 35 and again by the age of 45, and 90 per cent of women identified with cervical cancer to receive treatment. In an endeavour to meet the commitment and

protect our girls, the Government of India must consider launching HPV vaccination funded and implemented under the immunization programme. As we celebrate the cervical cancer awareness month this January, each one of us can play a part in helping the country secure the health of its women.

Women represent the cornerstone for a family's overall health and hence investing in their health and ensuring their access to quality care goes a long way in ensuring the well-being and future of a society. The necessary tools to stop women from suffering and dying from this preventable disease and eliminating it completely are available; thus our girls will live to see a world free of this deadly disease.

PTI man held for public censuring of Pak Govt

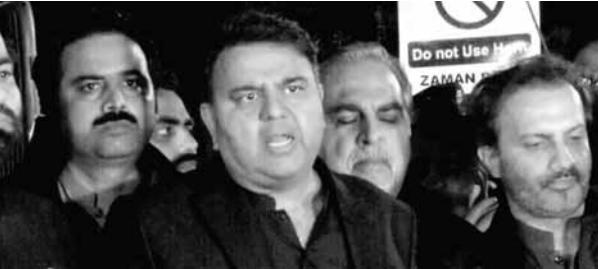

Pakistani authorities on Wednesday arrested Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party senior leader Fawad Chaudhry, hours after he publicly censured the government for scheming to arrest party chairman Imran Khan.

Fawad, a close aide of ousted prime minister Khan, was taken into custody from his residence in Lahore after a case was registered against him at Kohsar Police Station on the complaint of the Secretary Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP).

"This imported government has gone berserk," PTI leader Farrukh Habib tweeted.

An official PTI Twitter account also posted videos, showing a convoy of police vehicles which the party



claimed was carrying Chaudhry after his arrest.

The arrest of Fawad, 52, came amidst rumours that the government may arrest PTI chief and former premier Khan.

Fawad's arrest comes after he, along with scores of party workers, gathered outside Khan's Zaman Park residence in Lahore, claiming to avert the government's alleged plan to arrest the party chief.

The arrest of Fawad further

deepens political fault lines in Pakistan where the Khan-led opposition is demanding snap polls.

General elections in Pakistan are due after August. However, Khan is demanding snap polls.

"He (Chaudhry) was taken away from outside his house at 5:30 am in four cars that did not have any number plates," Faisal Chaudhry, the PTI leader's brother, was quoted as saying by the Dawn newspaper

British Home Secretary Suella Braverman is said to be on a collision course with the country's education department over plans to cut the period of stay allowed for overseas students under a post-study visa route, according to a UK media report on Wednesday.

The new Graduate Visa route, which allows foreign graduates - including Indians - the chance to stay on to job hunt and gain work experience for up to two years without the requirement of a specific job offer, is expected to be cut under Braverman's proposed review.

According to 'The Times', the Indian-origin home secretary has drawn up a plan to "reform" the Graduate Visa route requiring students to



obtain a work visa by getting a skilled job or leave the UK after six months. The newspaper refers to leaked advice to say that the UK Department for Education (DfE) is attempting to block the changes as they fear it would harm the UK's attractiveness to international students.

South Korea, Japan grapple with heavy snow chaos, delays

Frigid winter weather gripped East Asia for the second straight day on Wednesday, causing several deaths and multiple injuries in Japan and a scramble for flights out of South Korea's resort island of Jeju following delays by snowstorms.

Heavy snow and record cold temperatures brought widespread disruptions in Japan.

South Korea's Ministry of the Interior and Safety didn't

immediately report any major damage or injuries from sub-zero temperatures and icy conditions that have affected most of the country since Tuesday.

But at least eight roads and 10 sea routes remained closed as of Wednesday afternoon. About 140 homes in capital Seoul and nearby regions reported busted water pressure pumps or pipes as temperatures dipped to around minus 15 to minus 20 degrees Celsius (5 degrees to minus 4 degrees Fahrenheit) across the mainland.

Israeli troops kill Palestinian after attempted stabbing

Israeli troops shot and killed a Palestinian in the occupied West Bank on Wednesday, Palestinian officials said, the latest death in a surge of violence. The Israeli military said the Palestinian tried to stab a soldier.

The violence comes amid tensions over Israel's new government, it's most right-wing ever. On Wednesday, ultranationalist Cabinet minister Itamar Ben-Gvir promised to continue visits to a flashpoint Jerusalem holy site, despite pleas from neighbouring Jordan that Israel maintain a delicate status quo at the site.

The Palestinian Health Ministry identified the man shot as Aref Abdel Nasser Lahlouh, 20. The Israeli military said the man was carry-



ing a knife and was shot after he attempted to attack a soldier at a military post. Video on social media showed a man running toward soldiers and then falling to the ground.

Tensions have been high for months as Israel has been conducting nightly arrest raids in the West Bank, which were prompted by a spate of Palestinian attacks against Israelis last spring. Some 30 people were killed in Israel by Palestinians in 2022.

US reroutes \$72M in aid for wages for Lebanese army, police

AP ■ BEIRUT

The United States is rerouting USD 72 million of America's assistance to Lebanon to help the country's cash-strapped government boost wages of its soldiers and police officers, the US ambassador said Wednesday.

Washington is a key donor of the Lebanese Army and its 80,000 members, providing over USD 3 billion in military aid since 2006. The announcement Wednesday is the first time the US is allocating funds for wages of security personnel in Lebanon.

Lebanon, a tiny Mediterranean country of 6 million people, is struggling with an unprecedented economic crisis, one that the World Bank says is among the worst worldwide since the 1850s.

UN official: Aid groups press Taliban on ban on women's jobs

Heads of major aid groups are pressing the Taliban to reverse their decision to ban Afghan women from working for national and international nongovernmental groups, the UN humanitarian chief said on Wednesday.

The Taliban move last month to bar women from NGO work prompted major international aid agencies to suspend operations in



Afghanistan, though some have since resumed their work in parts of the country.

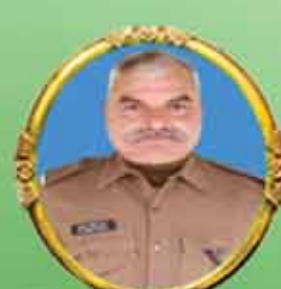

SKY VOTED ICC MEN’S T20 CRICKETER OF YEAR

Swashbuckling Indian batter Suryakumar Yadav was on Wednesday named the ICC Men's T20 Cricketer of the Year for his ridiculously good run in the shortest format of the game. Surya had a stellar 2022, breaking an array of records and setting a benchmark in the format. He beat the likes of Sam Curran, Pakistan wicketkeeper-batter Mohammad Rizwan and Zimbabwe's batting all-rounder Sikandar Raza for the top honour. India's newest fast-bowling star Renuka Singh become the recipient of ICC Emerging Women's Cricketer of the Year Award. However, India vice-captain and last year's Cricketer of the Year Smriti Mandhana lost out to Australia's Tahlia McGrath in the women's T20 category. Popularly known as 'SKY', the 32-year-old became just the second batter to make more than 1000 runs in a calendar year in T20Is and ended the year as the highest run-getter, scoring 1164 runs at a strike-rate of 187.43. Surya hit a stunning 68 sixes during the year, easily the most recorded by anyone in a year in the format's history. The Indian was the key batter for his team through the year, smashing two hundreds and nine half-centuries. Surya was at his stupendous best during the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2022 in Australia, recording three fifties in six

innings and averaging nearly 60. Notably, his strike-rate was yet again right up there at 189.68. Having already recorded a ton earlier in the year, Suryakumar continued his brilliant year after the multi-nation tournament, making his second hundred in T20Is in the bilateral series in New Zealand. Surya also became the top-ranked T20 player, achieving a career-high 890 rating points.

RENUKA WINS

There has been a buzz surrounding Renuka, who burst into life in a busy 12 months for the Indian women's team. The 26-year-old beat Australia's Darcie Brown, England's Alice Capsey and compatriot Yastika Bhatia to take home the emerging player award. The right-armer claimed 40 wickets for her country in 2022 in just 29 matches across the two white-ball formats, filling the void left by the great Jhulan Goswami. In the ODI game, Renuka was especially potent, taking 18 wickets at an average of just 14.88, of which eight came in two appearances against England and seven in India's series with Sri Lanka. Renuka troubled the Australian line-up in the seven T20I meetings across the year, taking eight wickets, and her performances across the Commonwealth Games and Asia Cup also grabbed attention. She claimed 17 wickets in 11 matches, at an economy of just

Siraj becomes world No. 1 bowler in ODIs

India pacer Mohammed Siraj on Wednesday became number one bowler in the ICC rankings for ODI bowlers, a testament to his rapid rise in international cricket. Siraj went past New Zealand's Trent Boult and Australia seamer Josh Hazlewood to become the top-ranked ODI bowler for the very first time. Not only has Siraj's form over the last 12 months been imperious, but his effort in the ODI series at home earlier this month against Sri Lanka and New Zealand has shown just how much the right-armer has improved in recent times. India bowling coach Paras Mhambrey challenged Siraj to work on certain aspects of his game last year and the extra training the energetic quick has put in has paid off. Siraj took nine wickets against Sri Lanka to be the leading wicket-taker for the three-game series and backed that up by claiming a four-wicket haul in the opening match of the recently-completed series against New Zealand. It means Siraj jumps to the

top of the ODI bowler rankings with 729 rating points, albeit narrowly, with his lead at the top over Hazlewood just two rating points higher than the Australian. Fellow India pacer Mohammed Shami has jumped 11 places to 32nd overall on the updated list for ODI bowlers, while there is plenty of movement at the top of the batter rankings following the completion of India's home series against the Kiwis. Pakistan skipper Babar Azam still enjoys a healthy lead at the top of the ODI batter rankings, but there is now a total of three India players inside the top 10 and chasing the highest accolade. In-form opener Shubman Gill is the eye-catcher as the right-hander jumps a whopping 20 places to sixth overall following a brilliant double hundred and a century against New Zealand at home. Gill rises in front of veteran Virat Kohli, who slipped to seventh following a quiet series against New Zealand, while Rohit jumped two places to equal eighth after his quickfire hundred against the Kiwis in Indore.


