# Rijiju slams judiciary for publicising IB, RAW files

It's a matter of grave concern, with implications, I will react at appropriate time, says Law Min

Continuing his campaign against the judiciary, Law Minister Kiren Rijiju on Tuesday said it was a "matter of grave concern" that the Supreme Court Collegium put in public domain certain portions of sensitive reports of the Intelligence Bureau (IB) and the Research and Analysis Wing (RAW) while reiterating the apex court's recommendation for elevation of five advocates as High Court Judges. Addressing a press conference at his Ministry's function on e-courts, Rijiju said Intelligence agency officials work in a secret manner for the nation, and they would "think twice" in future if their reports are made public, and making their reports public "will have an implication."

"Putting the sensitive or secret reports of the RAW and

IB in public domain is a matter of grave concern on which I will react at an appropriate time. Today is not the appropriate time," Rijiju told reporters amid a volley of questions in this regard.

This is for the first time that the Government has reacted to portions of these reports that were put in public domain by the Supreme Court

Collegiums. Asked whether he would 'sensitise' Chief Justice of India (CJI) DY Chandrachud in this regard, the Law Minister said he often meets the CJI. "We are always in touch. He is the head of the judiciary, and I am the bridge between the Government and the judiciary so we have to work together. You cannot work in isolation," he said. Rijiju also referred to

certain statements and tweets by politicians and lawyers slamming him for lowering the dignity of the top court by commenting on the Collegium. He said while appointments are an administrative issue, judicial pronouncements are "totally different."

"I am not commenting, or nobody should make any kind of comment when it is a judicial order. Some people may say that certain remarks are made which compromise the independence of the judiciary. So let us be very clear. When we are talking about the appointment process — this is an administrative matter. This has nothing to do with judicial order or pronouncement," he said.

Meanwhile, noted lawyer and former Law Minister Kapil Sibal condemned Rijiju's speech on Monday in which the Law Minister had said that though judges are not elected by people but they should bear in mind that people are watching their verdicts in this age of social media. "Are all your controversial statements meant to strengthen the judiciary? You might believe it. We lawyers don't," said Sibal.

The Supreme Court Collegium on January 19, reiterated its recommendation for appointing five judges, rejecting the intelligence agencies reports against them.

# Rahul tries to deflect Digvijaya's self-goal

Indian Army doesn't need to prove anything on surgical strikes: RaGa

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday tried to douse yet another controversy triggered by senior party leader Digvijaya Singh who questioned India's 'surgical strikes' against Pakistan. The BJP accused the Congress of insulting the armed forces in their hatred of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Terming Digvijaya Singh's views 'ridiculous', Rahul said, "The party completely disagreed with his statement. The Indian Army does not need to prove anything. The Armed Forces do their job exceptionally well." Rahul was talking to reporters enroute Srinagar.

Singh on Monday had accused the BJP Government at the Centre of "spreading lies" about surgical strikes.

"They (Centre) talk about surgical strikes and that they have killed so many of them but there is no proof. All they do is spread lies," he said.

After his comments, the BJP hit out at the Congress.

Late report on 2 unruly flyers lands AI in soup

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has imposed a penalty of ₹10 lakh on Air India for not reporting on time against two unruly passengers on a Paris-Delhi flight (AI-142) of December 6, 2022.

According to the DGCA, apart from not reporting the incident on time, the airline also delayed referring the matter to its Internal Committee. This is the second time in less than a week that the DGCA has taken enforcement action against the airline in connection with unruly passenger behaviour.

Meanwhile Air India on Tuesday said it has closed the internal probe into the urination case and will assist the flight's Pilot-in-Command with an appeal against the suspension of his licence by DGCA.

# MCD fails to elect Mayor again as House adjourned

The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) could not elect its Mayor for the second time on Tuesday as its proceedings were adjourned sine die following a ruckus between AAP and BJP Councillors.

This was the second attempt of the MCD to elect its first single Mayor in 10 years

following the unification of its three divisions last year.

The House was adjourned soon after members took oaths amid sloganeering by both the AAP and BJP Councillors. The adjournment prompted Councillors, 13 MLAs and three Rajya Sabha MPs of the AAP to sit on a "dharna" for nearly four hours against the BJP. Continued on Page 2

# SRK's comeback film 'Pathaan' sets advance booking record

Beating back boycott calls, Shah Rukh Khan starrer 'Pathaan' is set for the biggest opening for any Hindi film with 4.19 lakh tickets sold till Tuesday and 80 per cent occupancy on day one, even for early morning shows beginning at 6 AM or 7 AM, say industry insiders.

The film, which releases across 5,000 screens on Wednesday, could well signal a happy 2023 for an industry grappling with crippling losses following the Covid pandemic and a string of box office duds. The ticket surge is being seen in multiplexes, single screen theatres and also in the South.

"The film is going to take



a historic start at the box office with opening day collections of ₹45 crore to ₹50 crore. The box office revival will begin with 'Pathaan', especially looking at its advance booking. This is very rare. And tomorrow is a working day," trade analyst Taran Adarsh told PTI.

"This film is going to break the advance booking of 'KGF 2

and will do a business of ₹45 crore to ₹50 crore," agreed Rajendra Singh Jyala, chief programming officer at multiplex chain INOX.

"We have 7 AM shows at Inox and almost 80 per cent of it is full. The early morning shows are happening in cities like Mumbai, Delhi, Pune, Kolkata and a few others," Jyala told PTI.

The Yash Raj Films production, which marks Shah Rukh's return as a hero after 2018's 'Zero', will get a five-day extended opening weekend as it releases the day before Republic Day.

The advances of 'Pathaan' have exceeded all expectation, added Kamal Gianchandani, president of the Multiplex Association of India.

Power, Net cut, stones pelted at JNU students viewing BBC flick

# ‘Separate consultation next month on PIB fact check’

Amid outrage over a plan to give powers to its arm PIB to police fake news on social media, Union Minister Rajeev Chandrasekhar on Tuesday said that the Government will next month hold discussions with stakeholders before the proposal is implemented.

The Minister said that the rules for regulating online gaming are expected to be notified by January 31 after which these will be tabled in Parliament.

“We will hold a separate consultation (on PIB fact check) sometime early next month,” Chandrasekhar said when asked about clarification on the proposed amendment to the IT rules 2021.

Chandrasekhar also said that the consultation on the Digital Personal Data Protection Act is over and it is

being processed within the realms of the government for notification.

The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) last week released a modification to the draft Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021, which it had previously released for public consultation.

While the consultation is largely going on for framing rules for online gaming, it added a small note in the due diligence section for the removal of content identified as false, fake or misleading by the PIB or any government-authorised agency.

Under the proposed amendment, the due diligence by intermediaries shall include making such efforts to not upload, publish, transmit or share information identified

as fake or false by the Fact Check Unit of the Press Information Bureau, which takes cognizance of fake information both suo motu and by way of queries sent by citizens on its portal or through e-mail and WhatsApp and responds with correct information when the same pertains to the government.

The determination of fake news cannot be in the sole hands of the government and will result in the censorship of the press, the Guild said in a statement here, voicing “deep concern” over the draft amendment to the Information Technology (IT) Rules.

An official source, who did not wish to be named, said that the option of fact check by PIB or any other government authorised agency was added in the proposed amendment after discussion with industry.

# RPF getting training to man crowd, infra of Railways

In view of the need of a crowd management within the Indian Railways premises and to man its growing infrastructure, the national transporter security arm- Railway Protection Force (RPF) - are undergoing training at the Rapid Action Force (RAF) Academy for Public Order (RAPO), the only institute in the country specialized for public order management (POM). The training module mainly focuses on crowd / riot control, law and order, mob psychology, gender sensitization and human rights.

The newly inducted IRPSF probationers of Civil Service Examination (CSE)-2020 batch have been undergoing the POM course from January 23 to January 28, 2023 at the Meerut based RAPO.

As per the course module

the officers of RPF will be trained on mob psychology, public order management, anti-riot drill, platoon formation, less lethal weapons / equipment, future weapons, negotiation skill / conflict management and UAV. After the training these Officers will be able to deal crowd / riot with less lethal approach with minimum force within the railway premises.

To hone better skills in the field, even 41 non-gazetted RPF officers are seeking training at RAPO called as Training of Trainer (TOT) course (from January 9 to February 6, 2023) who will have to further relay the Public Order management to the trainees of RPF at RPF training centres at several locations in the country.

The opening ceremony of the course was addressed by Akhilesh Kumar Singh, DIGP /Principal, RAPO. Singh high-

lighted the key and important role of Indian railway and Role of RPF for the protection of Indian Railways. “POM is a very dynamic and challenging domain in the current world scenario and Officers / personnel of all the security forces must have the practical knowledge and training to handle such situations effectively,” Singh said in his address to the officers.

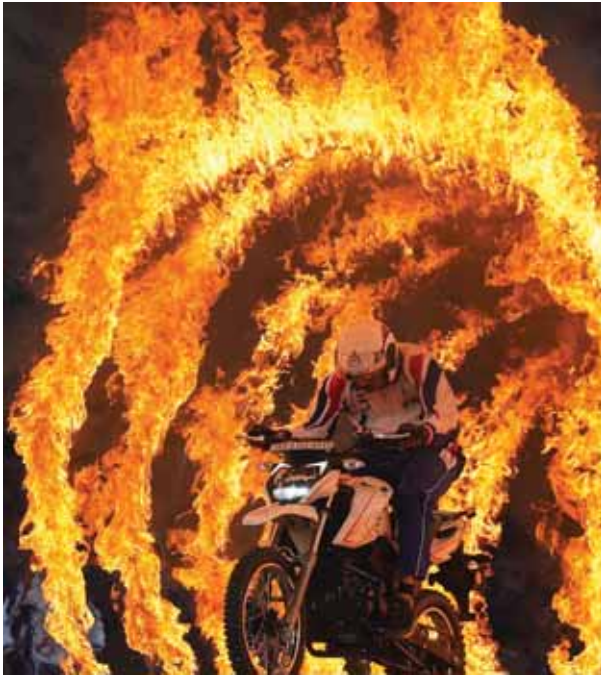
To its credit, International police of Myanmar & Zimbabwe also received training at RAPO besides the police forces from all across the states of India. “Since its foundation of the RAPO, it has trained more than 18000 Officers / personnel of State Police i.e. Indian Army, BSF, ITBP, RPF, Gujarat police, Tripura, Meghalaya, Bihar, Delhi, Chandigarh, Uttar Pradesh, J&K, Haryana, Odisha, Tamil Nadu and Rajasthan,” Akhilesh Singh mentioned on the occasion.

They sat on dharna at the Civic Centre, demanding immediate polls.

Both the BJP and AAP members held each other responsible for the derailment of the proceedings.

The BJP claimed that AAP councillors resorted to “pushing and shoving” to its member Sandeep Kumar in the House, while AAP councillors claimed that the former got the House adjourned as it lacked a majority.

Slated to begin at 11 am, the proceedings of the House got underway 20 minutes later. ‘Jai Shri Ram’, ‘Bharat Mata ki Jai’, ‘Inquilab Zindabad’ were among the slogans chanted by some councillors while others let out a cry of ‘Jo Bole So Nihala’ and ‘Inquilab Zindabad’ when called on the selected councillors to take oath.

The Lt Governor-nominated members took oath first despite AAP councilors’ strong objections to it. Presiding officer Satya Sharma then called on the elected councillors to take oath even as he drew flak from the AAP councillors.

The proceeding went largely smoothly till the councillors and nominated members were administered the oath. After the oath, the House was adjourned for 15 minutes during which several BJP councillors left their seats and raised slogans.

During this break, several BJP councilors started moving into the House chanting ‘Modi-Modi’ or ‘Modi zindabad’. They also raised slogans against the

AAP convener and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal. Further, there was a heated discussion between BJP and AAP members in one of the aisles of the MCD House. A few councillors from both parties then entered into a heated exchange on one of the aisles of the House following which the Presiding Officer adjourned the House without holding the poll.

“A House cannot run like this. This House is adjourned till next date,” Sharma said.

All AAP councillors, their 13 MLAs and three MPs sat in the House and demanded BJP councillors come back so that the Mayoral polls could be conducted.

Enraged by the move, the AAP accused the BJP of adjourning the House because it does not have the number for mayoral polls. AAP MLA Durgesh Pathak, who along with his party’s members sat on a “dharna” in the House, demanded that BJP councillors return to the House for the Mayoral elections.

“The BJP doesn’t have numbers that’s why he has adjourned the House. All our councillors are sitting here. If you have guts then come and get voting done. Respect the mandate of the people of Delhi,” Pathak said. “We will not leave the House until the BJP councillors return and polls are held. We will sit here until the elections are conducted,” said Pathak.

Refusing to vacate the house, the AAP councilors spent their time singing religious hymns and patriotic songs. Some of the songs were: ‘Achutam Keshavam’ and ‘Raghupati Raghav Raja Ram’.

AAP members called off their “dharna” around 7.30 pm amid chants of ‘Bharat Mata ki Jai’ and ‘Arvind Kejriwal

Zindabad’.

In the meantime, Rekha Gupta, the BJP’s Mayoral candidate and a three-time councillor from Shalimar Bagh, also staged a dharna at the Civic Centre in Central Delhi. Gupta claimed that the AAP started the ruckus that led to the adjournment of the House. “One of the AAP councillors, Praveen pushed our female councillor and I complained to (AAP MLA) Atishi about the incident. She hid him behind her. They were laughing and shoving. It is very shameful of them,” Gupta said.

Later slamming the BJP for creating hurdles in smooth mayoral polls, Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia on Tuesday asked the BJP to accept their defeat in the MCD polls and help ensure smooth conduct of mayoral elections. Sisodia, has accused the BJP of “running away from the election of Mayor”.

“Everyone saw the drama of the BJP. The public had got fed up with their rule in the MCD. They gave mountains of garbage to Delhi and ruined the entire Capital,” Sisodia said. “First, they avoided MCD elections and when the public showed them the door, they ran away from the election of mayor,” he said.

The House proceedings were reconvened on Tuesday to elect Delhi’s Mayor and Deputy Mayor amid heavy deployment of civil defence volunteers, personnel and marshals. The House had seen unprecedented chaos earlier this month (January 6), including fistfights and exchange of blows just weeks after the national Capital had elected its councillors.

This is the second time in the 15 days a ruckus led to the adjournment of the house and the mayor could not be elected.

The BJP said the Opposition was blinded by its “hate” for the Prime Minister and had “insulted” the Armed Forces.

On Tuesday while responding to several media questions Rahul himself set the record straight. “There are people who will say ridiculous things during conversation. I’m sorry to say so about a senior leader, he said a ridiculous thing,” Gandhi told reporters during the press conference.

“We have full trust in our army. If the army performs any task, there is no need to give any proof. I completely disagree with his statement and this is the official position of the Congress party,” Rahul emphasised when quizzed repeatedly.

Asked about action being taken by the Congress against Singh, Gandhi said the Congress is a democratic party and “not a dictatorship”.

“We don’t run our party on the principle of coercion. We don’t appreciate Singh’s personal views. But views of the party are above Digvijaya Singh’s views. The views are

generated from the conversation within the party. I would like to assure you that his views...are not views that are held by the centre of the party,” he said.

Gandhi said it is in the culture of the Congress to allow conversations. “Sometimes when those conversations happen people who have extreme views tell their views. So we try to manage a conversation. In the BJP and the RSS there is no conversation. They just decide that this is what is going to be and nobody can talk after that.” He said.

To another question whether Digvijaya Singh’s statement has undone the good work of Bharat Jodo Yatra, Rahul claimed, “I think, the yatra has achieved something fundamental and very powerful. What the yatra has done already and this cannot be changed now, it has shown that there are two visions of India. One is a hate filled, arrogant, cowardly vision and other is love filled, embracing, and brave vision and it has made those two visions absolutely crystal clear”.

Rahul further elaborated, “Not just myself, millions of

people have walked across the breadth of this country. They have supported this yatra and this yatra has changed the narrative in the country. You, in the media, might not like to accept it, but it’s a fact and nothing can change this”.

“One or two comments that are said by a leader, are not going to change the fundamental fact that the yatra has been a success. The yatra has brought India together, the yatra has shown that Indian people believe much more in love and affection than in hatred and anger. So, I am quite pleased with what this yatra has achieved” Rahul explained.

Rahul alleged the BJP and RSS spent huge sums of money to distort his image. Thousands of crores can’t hide the truth and you have witnessed it. The truth always comes out,” the 52-year-old said when asked if the Congress was spending crores of rupees to counter his ‘Pappu’ image.

Taking a jibe at Chairman of the Democratic Azad Party Ghulam Nabi Azad, Rahul Gandhi said 90 percent of the members of Ghulam Nabi Azad’s party are now in Congress.

### FAIMA URGES FOR NEET PG-23 EXAMS POSTPONEMENT

New Delhi: The Federation of All India Medical Association (FAIMA) has written to Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya to postpone NEET PG 2023 exam and re-consider internship eligibility for aspirants. It said that if the NEET PG 2023 examination is conducted on March 5, 2023, around 10,000 NEET aspirants will not be eligible to appear in the exam. “Due to the conduct of NEET PG 2022 stray counselling round on January 10, 2023, numerous students did not have enough time to prepare for the NEET PG 2023 exam,” it said.

### GMDA ORDERS DEPTS TO SPEED UP INFRA DEV WORK

The Ministry of External Affairs has trashed the documentary as a “propaganda

piece” that lacks objectivity and reflects a colonial mindset. However, Opposition parties have slammed the Government’s move to block access to the documentary.

Balaji, who was present for the screening, claimed that some students had downloaded the documentary on their mobiles and other devices.

“They (the JNU administration) have cut off the power and Internet. We shared the documentary with other students and are watching it together,” Balaji said.

Balaji also claimed that there were police personnel in civil clothes roaming on the campus. However, there was no immediate police response.

## Videos of girl, man in dishevelled appearance part of commercial ad: NMRC

A video of a young girl in a dishevelled appearance chasing a passenger inside the Noida-Greater Noida metro which has surfaced online and triggered speculations among social media users is an edited footage of a commercial advertisement, officials said Tuesday.

The purported video showed the young girl dressed up as the character of ‘Manjulika’ from popular comedy-horror film ‘Bhool Bhulaiyaa’. The girl was seen chasing a particular passenger on board the metro’s Aqua Line and engaging other commuters as well with her “scary” tactics, according to the video.

A man dressed up as a character from popular web series “Money Heist” on board the metro also showed up in a separate video, triggering speculations about safety concerns among some while others thought these were social media content creators making “reels”.

However, the Noida Metro Rail Corporation (NMRC), which operates the Aqua Line

between the twin cities in Gautam Buddha Nagar, confirmed Tuesday evening that these videos were part of a commercial advertisement shot on the metro premises with its permission.

“This is to clarify that video going viral on various social media platforms is a part of a commercial advertisement shooting which was held on December 22, 2022, under approved NMRC Policy for Film Shooting. Also, this video clip is morphed and edited,” NMRC Managing Director Ritu Maheshwari said.

The advertisement was for audio and wearables brand boAt, she said.

“The NMRC has approved Film Shooting Policy where it provides its infrastructure, including rolling stock on rental basis to earn non-fare box revenue. Ad film shooting was carried out by M/s Creative Productions (A Delhi-based film production house) for ‘boAt air dopes’ on the NMRC corridor,” Maheshwari said.

# ‘Redevelop structurally-damaged Signature View flats’

The Delhi Development Authority (DDA) has been directed to redevelop the "structurally damaged" Signature View Apartments in Mukherjee Nagar area in north Delhi and proactively support thousands of residents who have been facing grave danger to life and property.

Taking serious note of lapses that resulted in the building becoming structurally unsafe in just about 10 years of its construction, Delhi Lt Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena has also ordered, "immediate initiation of Criminal proceedings under the relevant provisions/rules, against the



contractors/builders/ construction agencies and a vigilance inquiry to identify all officers/ officials responsible for lapses/mis-conduct in the construction of said buildings within 15 days and initiation of subsequent criminal action against the defaulting officials accordingly." Built in 2007-2009, the apartments in

the complex were allotted to residents in 2011-2012 having 36 apartments ( 112 middle income group) and 224 Higher Income Group), located in 12 towers.

The project was completed in 2010. While allotting these apartments, DDA also collected Rs 20.80 crore from the allottees for providing maintenance for 30 years after allotment.

Shortly after, however, the flats started facing construction-related issues, forcing the residents to complain to the DDA. A 2021-2022 study conducted by IIT-Delhi at the behest of DDA found the building to be structurally unsafe. The study also made a recom-

mendation to "vacate and dismantle" the complex.

The Lt Governor's secretariat also directed the DDA to ensure incorporation of mandatory clauses in its tender documents that in case of any eventuality of structural defects, due to poor construction/material comes to light, criminal action along with financial recovery shall be initiated against the developer or contractor.

In its noting dated January 23, the L-G Secretariat, has asked the DDA to draw up a redevelopment and rehabilitation plan for the complex, in consultation with the RWA. This, Raj Niwas official said, should serve as a message from

LG to all officials and contractors that no laxity, misconduct or collusion will be tolerated and that the residents of the City were supreme.

"This is a case of gross negligence and apparent criminal misconduct putting at large in danger. Allottees demonstrated trust in DDA while buying these apartments. As a public organization, DDA must own the defects and take urgent remedial measures. If it is not safe for habitation.

DDA must own the responsibility for providing feasible alternatives to the allottee and take strictest action against the responsible entity," Raj Niwas secretariat said in its file noting. The LG over ruled

the DDA that was inter alia, shirking its responsibility by maintaining on file that, "These allotments are not part of Social Welfare Schemes; that there is no law which makes DDA responsible for building in perpetuity, or even in the period in question or it is not the duty of DDA to maintain the buildings"

He has said, that, "apparently, there has been no application of mind on the part of Legal Deptt of DDA and the position taken by the DDA, not only runs contrary to the very basic tenet of responsibility and empathy, essentially inherent in the functioning of any service provider - especially so, a Govt organisation, but also

runs in contravention of principle of natural justice, since, the DDA had charged the consumer in the name of "Maintenance Charges for 30 years."

Built in 2007-2009, the apartments in the complex were allotted to residents in 2011-2012 having 36 apartments ( 112 middle income group) and 224 Higher Income Group), located in 12 towers. The project was completed in 2010.

## BJP running away from Mayor elections: Sisodia

While a majority of councillors took oath in Hindi, some took the same in English and a few others chose to read the text in Punjabi, Urdu, Sanskrit and even Maithili.

AAP mayoral candidate Shelly Oberoi and BJP's candidate for the post Rekha Gupta, both took oath in Hindi. Oberoi was welcomed by her party colleagues with a thumping of the desk as she stepped on the dais, and chant-

ed 'Jai Hind, Jai Bharat' after taking the oath. Gupta was greeted by BJP members with a ringing chant of 'Jai Shri Ram' as she rose to take oath as a councillor. The nominees for the post of deputy mayor are Aaley Mohammad Iqbal and Jalaj Kumar (AAP) and Kamal Bagri (BJP).

Iqbal, a councillor from Chandni Mahal, who had won the election with a maximum margin of votes, took the oath in chaste Urdu. He chanted 'Hindustan Zindabad' after taking oath while fellow party councillor Ankush Narang took the oath in Punjabi and chanted 'Wahe Guru ji ka Khalsa, Wahe Guru ji ka Fateh' after it.

One of the councillors even took oath in Maithili much to everyone's surprise. BJP's Kamal Bagri, who came to the House wearing a traditional dress and a colourful 'pagdi', took the oath in Sanskrit, and chanted 'Jai Siya Ram' after it, which was reciprocated with 'Har Har Mahadev' from a member sitting in the House. 'Jai Shri

Ram', 'Bharat Mata ki Jai', 'Inquilab Zindabad' were among the slogans chanted by various councillors and nominated members of the MCD House.

Earlier in the day, Presiding Officer Satya Sharma administered the oath to the nominated members before the elected representatives of the MCD as AAP members raised "shame shame" chants in the House. Slated to begin at 11 AM, the proceedings of the House got underway 20 minutes later.

## Delhi Police conducts verification drive in Capital ahead of R-Day

The Delhi Police have stepped up anti-sabotage checks, verification drives and patrolling in the national Capital ahead of Republic Day to thwart any untoward incidents. Anti-sabotage checks are being conducted in markets, high footfall areas and other prominent places by the Bomb Disposal Team along with dog squads, police said.

The police are checking hotels and lodges as well as sensitising the staff there to inform police immediately about any suspicious person or activity, they said. All Assistant Commissioner of Police and Station House Officers have been holding meetings with members of the Residents Welfare Association and Market Welfare Associations and briefing them about security measures in place for Republic Day, police said.

The Delhi Police has also been creating awareness on social media and asking people to

alert them about any suspicious person, activity or article, they said. Tenant and servant verifications are also being done, police said, adding that surprise checks are being conducted at hotels, guest houses and 'dharamsshalas', police said.

Several districts have also conducted mock drills to check their preparedness for anti-terror measures, police said. According to officials, anti-terror measures have been intensified in coordination with other security agencies since Delhi has always been a target for terrorists or anti-social elements.

This year, extra pickets have been deployed on bordering areas to ensure no mischievous elements gain entry into the national capital, officials said. Besides the internal meetings of Delhi Police, inter-state coordination meetings are also being held to ensure there are no lapse of security, they said, adding that checking have been intensified at malls, markets, railway and metro stations and bus terminals.

## 'L-G bypassing AAP Govt in issuing prosecution sanction'

AAP leader and Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia on Tuesday accused Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena and Delhi Chief Secretary Naresh Kumar had created a situation where people accused of committing serious crime "might get away scot-free". Sisodia said the prosecution sanction for crimes committed against the State has to be given by the State Government.

He said it has led to a situation where those accused of committing serious offences against the State might walk away free. Sisodia has directed the chief secretary to place before him a list of all such cases by Wednesday in which approval was not taken from the minister.

"Many serious crimes fall under this category. According to the Law Department of the Delhi Government, "state Government" in this law means elected government. This means that the minister in charge is the competent authority and the minister's approval was supposed to be taken in all these cases.

After taking the minister's approval, the file would be sent to Honourable L-G to decide whether he differed from the decision of the minister and whether he would like to refer it to President of India," Deputy Chief Minister said. He said it is elected government that issues a prosecution sanction. In a statement later, the government said the procedure



was being followed till a few months back. However, in the past few months, the chief secretary started bypassing the minister and sending all the files directly to the LG, it said.

"LG also gave 'approvals' in all these cases though he is not the approving authority. Therefore, in all such criminal cases in last few months, sanctions given for prosecution are invalid. When accused will raise this point in courts, they will be released," the statement said.

"Hon. LG's over-enthusiasm to bypass elected govt on every matter has created a crisis situation wherein many people accused of committing serious crimes against the state might go scot free," he said in a tweet.

The LG has issued "invalid prosecution sanctions bypassing the elected government," he said, without elaborating. Under Section 196(1) of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), a valid sanction for prosecution from the state government is a prerequisite for certain offences, Sisodia, who is Minister-in-charge, said.

# US distances itself from BBC's docu on Modi

The US has distanced itself from the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC)'s controversial documentary series on Prime Minister Narendra Modi saying it is "not familiar" with the documentary. However, the US said it is familiar with the shared values that connect Washington and New Delhi as two thriving and vibrant democracies.

Responding to questions raised by a Pakistani journalist, US State Department Spokesperson Ned Price on late Monday told reporters that Washington shares an "exceptionally deep partnership" with New Delhi based on values that are common to both the US and Indian democracies.

When the journalist pressed further on the BBC documentary, Price said: "I'm not familiar with (the BBC) documentary (on 2002 Gujarat riots) you're referring to. I am very familiar with the shared values that connect the United States and India as two thriving, vibrant democracies."

"When we have concerns about actions that are taken in India, we've voiced those. We've had an occasion to do that. But we want first and foremost to reinforce those values that are at the heart of our relationship," Price said, with the Biden



Administration, like the British Government, distancing itself from such a documentary. Price said there are several elements that bolster Washington's global strategic partnership with New Delhi, which include political, economic and through people-to-people ties.

"What I will say broadly is that there are a number of elements that undergird the global strategic partnership that we have with our Indian partners. There are close political ties. There are economic ties. There are exceptionally deep people-to-people ties between the US and India," he added.

"But one of those additional elements are the values that we share, the values that are common to American democracy and to Indian democracy.

India, of course, is the world's largest democracy. It's a vibrant democracy. And again, we look to everything that ties us together, and we look to reinforce all of those elements that tie us together," Price told reporters at his daily news conference. The Indian government has condemned the BBC's

controversial documentary, which has not been screened in India, as a "propaganda piece" with a questionable agenda behind it.

"We think that this is a propaganda piece, designed to push a particular discredited narrative. The bias, lack of objectivity and continuing colonial mindset is blatantly visible," Ministry of External Affairs(MEA) spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said last week.

Last week, British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak defended Prime Minister Modi over the BBC documentary, asserting that he "did not agree with the characterisation" of his Indian counterpart. Several members of the Indian diaspora in the UK have sent complaints to the BBC over the characterisation of the Indian leader in the series.

Meanwhile, the US has reaffirmed that the pace, the scope and the character of any dialogue between India and Pakistan is a matter for the two countries, asserting that Washington has always supported talks between the two neighbours to ensure peace in South Asia.

Responding to a question raised by a Pakistani journalist on Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's recent remarks seeking peace talks with India, Price said even though the United States wants to see regional stability in South Asia, its relationships with Pakistan and India "stand on their own".

# Cong disrespectful to Armed forces: BJP

Prasad raps Rahul for dismissing Digvijaya's comment on surgical strikes as his personal opinion

Claiming that Rahul Gandhi's 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' is turning out to be a "Bharat todo yatra", the BJP on Tuesday slammed the former Congress president for dismissing his party colleague Digvijaya Singh's controversial comments on surgical strikes as his "personal opinion" and asked the Opposition party to make its stand clear on the issues of terrorism and national security.

Latching on to former Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister's Digvijaya Singh for raising questions on surgical strikes during the ongoing 'Bharat Jodo yatra' passing by Jammu & Kashmir, the BJP alleged that Congress has been "disrespectful" to the armed forces and been making "insulting" remarks against them in the past.

Addressing a press conference here senior BJP leader and former Union Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad asked as why Rahul could not convince Digvijaya who he said been with him since the beginning of the 'Yatra' from Kanya Kumari his party's view on the issue and "Why did Rahul Gandhi take so long to publicly declare his respect for the armed forces".

"Rahul Gandhi ji, even after walking thousands of kilometers with you, why couldn't you teach Digvijaya Singh to respect the Army?

This is not the first time he (Singh) has spoken against the Army. This time he did it in Kashmir, it is a matter of great shame," said BJP leader. He lashed-out at Rahul for dismissing Digvijaya Singh's controversial comments on surgical strikes as his "personal opinion".

Referring to former Chief Minister raising questions on surgical strikes, Prasad said the 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' of which Digvijaya Singh is also a co-organizer "is turning-out to be a 'Bharat todo yatra' The BJP

leader also asked the Congress to make its stand clear on the issues of terrorism and national security. Prasad said the Congress has a habit of projecting uncomfortable views of its leaders as their personal views and asked if there is any limit to such opinion.

"The question is what is the standard of these leaders when it comes to respecting our armed forces. Indians do not seek proof of their heroics but salute them," Prasad told reporters, noting that Singh has a history of taking controver-

The 14th edition of Aero India, held every two years, will be held in Bengaluru from February 13 to 17.

Reviewing the preparations for the prestigious exhibition here, Rajnath said Aero India 2023 will not just be an event, but a display of the growing prowess of the defence and aerospace sector and the rise of a strong and self-reliant

'New India', the defence ministry said. The defence minister urged all the stakeholders to ensure "foolproof" arrangements for the participants.

Officials said 731 exhibitors have registered for the event so far. The five-day event on the theme 'the runway to a billion opportunities' will be the largest-ever aero show organised at Air Force Station, Yelahanka in a total area of around 35,000 sq metres, the

defence ministry said. Officials said the defence ministers' conclave, with the theme 'shared prosperity through enhanced engagement in defence (SPEED)', and a CEOs' roundtable are among the marquee events being organised as part of the Aero India.

The Manthan start-up event and Bandhan ceremony, which witnesses signing of MoUs, will also be part of the event, along with a fabulous air

show on all the five days. It will showcase the paradigm shift the government has brought in the aim of organising such events, the ministry said.

The events have been restructured with focus on increasing defence exports and forging partnerships rather than merely import of weapons and equipment.

Rajnath noted the Indian defence industry is going through a transformational phase and the active participation of the private sector is the biggest catalyst to that change.

He said though Aero India is a business event, it also aims to strengthen the country's relations with other nations.

He commended Bengaluru for successfully organising several editions of Aero India, say-

ing that the event is shaping Karnataka as an epicentre of aviation and aerospace industry. Rajnath described Karnataka as one of the leading states which contributes to the economic growth of the country.

Karnataka Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai and state government officials joined the meeting through video conferencing, while Chief of Defence Staff(CDS) General Anil Chauhan, Chief of the Air Staff Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhary, Chief of the Naval Staff Admiral R Hari Kumar, Chief of the Army Staff General Manoj Pandé, Defence Secretary Giridhar Aramane and other senior officials of Ministry of Defence attended the meeting physically.

# Navy carrying out mega war game in Indian Ocean Region

The Indian Navy is carrying out a mega war game in the strategically important Indian ocean region where China has substantially increased its naval imprint. The war game involves almost all operational assets like warships, submarines and aircraft there to hone its operational readiness.

The biennial Theatre Level Operational Readiness Exercise (TROPEX) is aimed at "validating and refining" the Navy's concept of "operations" as well as to test overall combat capabilities, officials said here on Tuesday.

The TROPEX will last for three months from January to March and assets of the Indian

Army, the Indian Air Force and the Coast Guard are being deployed for the mega drills.

"As part of the exercise, all surface combatants of the Indian Navy including destroyers, frigates, corvettes as well as submarines and aircraft are put through complex maritime operational deployments to validate and refine the Navy's concept of operations including operational logistics and interoperability with other services," Navy spokesperson Commander Vivek Madhwal said. He said the exercise is being conducted in different phases, both in harbour and at sea, encompassing various facets of combat operations including live weapon firings.

"Having grown in scope and complexity over the years, this exercise provides an oppor-

tunity to test the combat readiness of the combined fleets of the Indian Navy to operate in a multi-threat environment," he said.

"The maritime exercise also facilitates operational level interaction with the Indian Army, Indian Air Force and the Coast Guard, which will further strengthen interoperability and joint operations in a complex environment," he said. Separately, the Navy also conducted the biennial tri-services amphibious exercise (AMPHEX) 2023 at Kakinada in Andhra Pradesh from January 17 to 22.

The exercise focused on joint training of elements of all three services in various facets of amphibious operations to enhance interoperability and synergy.

# WHO for action to protect kids from spurious medicines

Concerned at the reports of Cdeath among children due to cough syrups and medicines in some countries, the World Health Organisation (WHO) has issued an "urgent call to action" to the members to detect and respond to incidents of falsified medical products and protect children from contaminated medicines.

The global health agency said that over the past four months, countries reported several incidents of over-the-counter (OTC) cough syrups for children with confirmed or suspected contamination with high levels of diethylene glycol (DEG) and ethylene glycol (EG). The cases are from at

least seven countries, associated with more than 300 fatalities in three of these countries, with most young children under the age of five. The WHO said the contaminants are toxic chemicals used as industrial solvents and antifreeze agents that can be fatal even in small amounts, and should never be found in medicines.

"WHO is releasing an urgent call to action to countries to prevent, detect and respond to incidents of substandard and falsified medical products," the global health agency said. Since October last year, the WHO has issued three global medical alerts over substandard paediatric medicines and syrups.

In October 2022, it issued

an alert over Promethazine Oral Solution, Kofexmalin Baby Cough Syrup, Makoff Baby Cough Syrup and Magrip N Cold Syrup manufactured by Maiden Pharmaceuticals Limited, Haryana, India.

The four "substandard products" were identified in the Gambia and reported to the WHO in September 2022, then in November, an alert was issued by the health agency over eight products, including Unibebi Cough Syrup, Unibebi Demam Paracetamol Drops and Unibebi Demam Paracetamol Syrup, identified in Indonesia and manufactured by PT Afi Farma.

Earlier this month, the WHO issued an alert to warn against the use of two "sub-standard" cough syrups man-

ufactured by Marion Biotech, India that have been linked to the deaths of 18 children in Uzbekistan.

Ambranol syrup and DOK-1 Max syrup were manufactured by Marion Biotech, based in Noida, Uttar Pradesh. The global health organisation issued the alert saying the syrups fail to meet quality standards and contain contaminants that can prove fatal. The WHO's medical product alerts were rapidly disseminated to the national health authorities of all 194 WHO Member States.

These medical product alerts requested the detection and removal of contaminated medicines from circulation in the markets; increased surveillance and diligence within the

supply chains of countries and regions likely to be affected; immediate notification to WHO if these substandard products are discovered in-country; and otherwise inform the public of the dangers and toxic effects of the substandard medicines at issue.

It noted that since these are not isolated incidents, the WHO called on regulators and governments to detect and remove from circulation in their respective markets any substandard medical products that have been identified in the alerts as potential causes of death and disease; ensure that all medical products in their respective markets are approved for sale by competent authorities and obtainable from authorised/licensed suppliers.



# ‘Make WB Fin Secy party in PIL on Central funds’

There was more trouble for the Mamata Banerjee Government with the Calcutta Bench of Chief Justice PrakashSrivastava and Justice Rajarshi Bhardwaj directed the petitioner to include the name of the senior IAS officer as a party in the case.

# MASS SUICIDE IN PUNE

## Bodies of 7 members of family fished out of river

In a shocking case of mass suicide, the Pune police fished out the bodies of seven members of a family from the bed of Bhima river in Daund taluka of Pune district during the last five days.

The seven members of family of one Mohan Uttam Pawar allegedly committed suicide by jumping into the water of Bhima river, after he was upset over his son's act of eloping with a married woman some days ago.

The seven members from Mohan Pawar's family — whose bodies were recovered on January 18, 20,21 and 22, 2023 — had reportedly taken a plunge into the Bhima river on the night of January 17.

The bodies recovered from the river comprised that of Pawar himself, his wife, his daughter and their three children. They were identified as Mohan Uttam Pawar, wife Sangeeta Mohan Pawar, married daughter Rani Shama, her husband Shyama Phulaware and their three male children.

The investigations by the local police have revealed Pawar was annoyed with his son Amol's decision to elope with a married woman in a relative's family. Amol is one of the two sons of Pawar, the other being Rahul. While Rahul lived in Pune, Amol lived with him in Pargaon village in Pune's neighbouring Ahmednagar district..

Having heard the news about Amol's elopement with a married woman, Sr Pawar had telephoned Rahul and told him that the latter's act would bring down the reputation of his family. However, Amol was in no mood to change his mind.

Sr Pawar had initially threatened Amol that if the latter did not sever ties with the woman he eloped with, he and other family members would commit suicide by consuming poison. Even Pawar's another son Rahul tried unsuccessfully to persuade his brother Amol.

The investigations by the police have revealed that Sr Pawar and his other family members left home in a car after 11 pm on January 17.

# SC eases ‘living will’ guidelines, removes Magistrate’s approval

In a bid to make the guidelines on “living will” more workable and less cumbersome, the Supreme Court on Tuesday removed the condition that mandated a Magistrate's approval for withdrawal or withholding of life support to a terminally ill person. Living will is an advance medical directive on end-of-life treatment.

The Supreme Court's 2018 order on passive euthanasia wherein it recognised the right to die with dignity as a fundamental right and an aspect of Article 21 (right to life) notwithstanding, people wanting to get a “living will” registered were facing problems due to cumbersome guidelines, prompting a reconsideration by the apex court. A five-judge Constitution bench headed



by Justice KM Joseph said the document will now be signed by the executor of the living will in the presence of two attesting witnesses, preferably independent, and attested before a notary or Gazetted Officer.

“The witnesses and the notary shall record their satisfaction that the document has been executed voluntarily and without any coercion or inducement or compulsion and with full understanding of all

the relevant information and consequences,” the bench, also comprising Justices Ajay Rastogi, Aniruddha Bose, Hrishikesh Roy and Justice CT Ravikumar, said.

As per the top court's 2018 judgment, a living needed to be signed by the person making the will in the presence of two witnesses and a Judicial Magistrate of First Class (JMFC). The top court also agreed to the suggestion that the executor shall inform and hand over a copy of the advance directive to the family physician, if any.

It also okayed the suggestion that in the event of the executor becoming terminally ill and undergoing prolonged medical treatment with no hope of recovery, the treating physician, when made aware about the Advance Directive, shall ascertain the genuineness and authenticity of the case.

# BSP to organise camps in villages to boost party base

The Bahujan Samaj Party, which lost power in Uttar Pradesh 11 years ago, will now organise camps in rural areas to strengthen the party base before the next Lok Sabha elections to be held next year.

This mission of the BSP will be based on the lines of its founder Kanshi Ram's cadre camp through which the party had spread its base and formed the government four times under Mayawati in Uttar Pradesh.

According to reports, these cadre camps of the BSP will be mainly organised in the villages as the party wanted to re-establish the connection with rural masses which were earlier seen as the party's core vote bank. Under this campaign, the

party will set up camps in villages without making any propaganda or much fanfare.

There will be neither a stage nor a chair in the camp and everyone will sit on the ground and give the message of respect to everyone in BSP. The party hopes that this will help them make a direct connection with the downtrodden section of the society.

The BSP, which has not formed the government in the State for the last 11 years, is gradually losing its base as it was not just out of power in the state but in the last assembly elections, the party could win just one seat. The BSP, which formed the government with an absolute majority (206 seats) in the 2007 Uttar Pradesh Assembly elections, was reduced to 80 seats in 2012.

# GIC discusses green clearance, land policies of Rly, road depts

## Mins agree to expedite infra projects

The statement said discussions were also held on policy matters related to environment/forest/wildlife clearance, railways and power, among others. Environment clearances and land policies of the railways and MoRTH and

making comprehensive guidelines for environment and forest clearance were also discussed at length.

“The concerned officers were directed to expedite the process of clearance and implementation of the above matters, the statement said, adding that the stakeholder ministries/ departments agreed to look into various issues raised and resolve the same in order to expedite infrastructure projects,” read the statement.

MoS MoRTH and Civil Aviation Gen (Dr.) V. K. Singh (Retd.), Minister of State for Power Krishan Pal Gurjar, Minister of State for Ports, Shipping and Waterways Shripad Naik, and Minister of State for Defence & Tourism Ajay Bhatt, too were present in the meeting.

Senior Officers from Road Transport and Highways Ministry, Defence Ministry, Ports, Shipping and Waterways (MoPSW), Environment, Forests and Climate Change, Railways, Commerce, Industry, Power, Civil Aviation Ministries, NHA and representatives from States attended the meeting.

# New politics

Rahul Gandhi has done well by dissociating the party from Singh's comments on surgical strikes

Senior Congress leader and former Madhya Pradesh chief minister Digvijaya Singh seems to relish being in news—even if that harms his own party. His recent statement there is no proof of surgical strikes exemplifies his penchant for attracting attention. Rahul Gandhi did the sensible thing by dissociating the party from Singh's comments. Gandhi unequivocally said that Congress leaders "disagree with Digvijaya Singh's views." He went on to say that the armed forces do their "job exceptionally well. They don't need to be providing proof." The grand old party would like to believe that Gandhi's statement would bring a closure to the issue. But the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which on Monday had condemned Singh for questioning the 2016 surgical strike, is unlikely to let his recent remarks be buried. It has already said that he "echoes Pakistan's narrative" on the Pulwama terror attack which killed 40 CRPF personnel in 2019. It will keep raking up his remarks. Worse, Singh himself is likely to come up with statements that the BJP loves to denounce. For how Rahul Gandhi would keep disagreeing with Singh's intemperate statements is a question that the party top brass must deliberate on. Perhaps Singh says such things to make headlines; perhaps his politics of championing the cause of Muslims has resulted in a temperament that triggers such remarks; it is, however, the GOP that gets hurt. Championing the cause of Muslims—which usually meant pandering



to the most retrograde sections of the community, and which the BJP rightly calls Muslim appeasement—was a winning proposition in the pro-Modi era. Many a political career was made just by mouthing the fashionable, 'secular' homilies. Intellectual elites, most of them of Left-liberal disposition, were quite accommodating towards politicians whose 'secular credentials' were impeccable. So, Lalu Prasad Yadav got considerable traction despite serious charges of corruption against him and the withering away of the administration in Bihar under his watch. Digvijaya Singh flourished in that era. He called the Batla House encounter on September 19, 2008, at Jamia Nagar in Delhi "fake." This was despite the fact that in that encounter an ace Delhi Police officer was killed and the Delhi Police was under his own party's government. In 2016, he repeated his demand for a judicial probe into the encounter. Other Congress leaders have also played the same game. In 2012, for instance, the then law minister Salman Khurshid said Congress president Sonia Gandhi "wept bitterly" when she came to know about the young Muslim boys killed in the encounter. The BJP correctly called Khurshid's statement as a "communal ploy to get Muslim votes." That was then. The dynamics of politics were conducive for such ploys. But that politics is well past its expiry date. The sooner Singh recognises this fact, the better for his party.

# Don't intervene

Thousands of tech employees are being laid off every day, but Govt intervention is not needed

These are bad days for tech employees. A layoffs tracking site reported last week that, on an average, over 1,600 tech employees were being given the pink slip every day this month. On Monday, the website came up with something even worse: the number had gone up to 3,000. The situation got exacerbated because Big Tech icons like Microsoft and Google also began retrenching employees. In the last calendar year, more than 1,000 companies reportedly laid off 154,336 workers. There is turmoil among tech workers. It is also evident from the increasing popularity of LinkedIn, a business and employment-focused social media platform. In 2022, it was downloaded 58.4 million times all over the world. Unsurprisingly, LinkedIn is brimming with job searches, help and counsel from friends to their retrenched friends, etc. Thankfully, the Government has not shown any intention of coercing or coaxing tech majors to go slow on layoffs. In November, of course, Information Technology Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw had slammed Elon Musk's decision to sack Twitter employees in India: "We condemn the way Twitter has sacked employees in India," said Vaishnaw, adding that the employees "should have given the employees a fair time for transition." But then liberals and the mainstream media love to criticise Musk for his unforgivable 'crime' of being a free speech "absolutist." The Honourable Minister might have been trying to be fashionable when he condemned Musk.



Over a month later, Minister of State for Information Technology Rajeev Chandrasekhar also talked about retrenchment in the IT sector, but his views were rational and balanced. He said that while the Government "probably cannot" intervene to stop layoffs in the IT sector, it was working to ensure these job losses are "soft landings." He rightly pointed out that there are enough jobs for talented people. He also talked about a Rs 460-crore "reskilling" plan. That's the correct approach; the Government can help the sector, and employees in it, by providing indirect support, one of which is reskilling. It should avoid a ham-handed approach, involving diktats to the top brass of IT majors. That may win the Government brownie points in the political arena, but would do no good to either the sector or, in the long run, to the people working there. So far, the Government has avoided such a populist stance. Hopefully, it will stay the course.

# Civilian facade of Thai military

Thai Military Generals have managed to subvert civil rule by manipulating the democratic process

Thailand, the favorite destination for Indian tourists, is an instructive case for the study of civil-military relations. Control of the military by civil authority, the accepted democratic norm, is frequently challenged by the Palace, the third player even though monarchy is constitutional. An election is around the corner on 7 May with the parliamentary term ending on 23 March. Currently, a coalition led by the Palang Pracharath Party (PPRP) the military which includes three Generals, all former Army Chiefs, has ruled the country since 2014. The two Generals in subordinate political positions are senior to the Prime Minister. The billionaire PM Thaksin Shinawatra, who was ousted in a military coup in 2006, was followed by his sister Yingluck becoming Prime Minister later and now his daughter Paetongtarn is carrying the flag of Pheu Thai Party (PTP). King Maha Vajiralongkorn, Rama X, barred his elder sister, who renounced royalty, from contesting elections with Thaksin's PTP. Shinawatra according to a report in The Bangkok Post in May 2005 had made arrangements with the Palace to control the Generals.

The PPRP is led by Deputy Prime Minister, Pravit Wongsuwon, the senior most General; Gen Prayut Chan-o-cha junior most General is PM with Interior Minister Gen Anupong Paochinda. Wongsuwon last month told reporters that his party will decide whether he will be PM but he prefers "military life to political one". He was confident his party would remain in power as part of a coalition. The Sunday China Morning Post of December 2022 reported that three of four Thais think PTP should be in power and Paetongtarn was the favorite leader to end the decade-old military rule. The National Institute of Development Administration polls showed she was 10 percentage points ahead of Prayuth and PTP ahead of PPRP and other political parties. But unless all political parties unite against the Generals' PPRP they have no chance of defeating them.



Brad Adams, director of Human Rights Watch said that the military has made itself invulnerable by framing laws to dissolve the main opposition party, control the Election Commission, and hand-pick the Senate (which decides on government formation) to thwart the will of the people. Wongsuwon publicly stated it is not difficult for his party to form a government as the Senate is 'controllable'. Thai Generals have taken a leaf out of neighboring absolute military rulers of Myanmar's 2008 constitution into their 2017 constitution. Only a landslide victory by a single party like the National League of Democracy of Aung San Suu Kyi achieved in 2021 (which resulted in the coup) can undo military rule in Thailand. The 2017 constitution allows the nomination of 250 Senators (mostly Army and Police) that can dilute the verdict of the 500-strong House of elected Representatives. Rules have been so framed that the military needs only one-third of the elected house for government formation. The Generals have given a civilian facade to the military government – to put it crudely – like a wolf in sheep's clothing.

The military (and police) in Thailand is one of the most politicized entities in this part of the universe. My Thai colleagues at Command and

General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth (US) in 1975 mentioned how they made their political choices while in the Military Academy. Recently, the constitution was believed to have been amended to give the King special powers and certain special forces placed under his command. The Army Chief 2018, the son of a former coup leader, led his officers on bended knees and folded hands, to swear an oath of allegiance to the King at Army Headquarters in Bangkok. Gen Prayuth outdid him saying: "I will worship and protect monarchy". Generals are galore – for every 212 troops one flag rank officer. In India, 21,000 soldiers make one General. The Army has prepared a 20-year Strategic Development Plan which governments are required to follow.

Although absolute monarchy ended in 1932, the constitutional monarchy prevailed with the previous monarch the most revered King who ruled for 70 years, slightly less than the term of Queen Elizabeth II. It is not clear which way the pendulum is swinging in Palace-Military relations at present. South China Morning Post reported that 'normally the Army proposes and the King disposes of. Very strict laws exist on royal defamation under lese' majeste – 15 years in jail under Law 112 for

expression against Monarchy. Protests for reforming monarchy erupted recently though mostly by youth who use code words to refer to their targets.

Two tragic events occurred last December – the sinking of a Thai warship with several sailors drowned; and the cardiac arrest of the Crown Princess (apparently first in the line of succession) still in a coma. The effects of the pandemic have struck a body blow to tourism, the mainstay of the economy. Fortunately, the tourist footfall in 2022 has crossed the 10mn mark.

India has strong and friendly relations with Thailand with 50,000 Indians gainfully employed from Gaggan Anand's two Michelin Star restaurants to Gunjan Kumar's mobile chana jor garam enterprise. Statues of Hindu gods and goddesses are dotted all over Thailand with many beautiful Tamil kovils. There are strong Buddhist links also with Thailand. The Shinawatra scion may give the Generals shivers but the ruling trio of Generals is bound to return for a third term four months from now.

Presently, this element in education is neglected, as a result of which many highly educated people do not know how to live a peaceful life and how to face their problems without much mental tension.

It is found that the present system of education does not cultivate the qualities of tolerance, self-control, humility, service, co-operation, concern for the wellbeing of society, and responsibility for one's own actions. Also, students are not given a clear knowledge of the value of simplicity, honesty, justice, non-violence and fair play. The result is that even after spending so many years in a school and college or at the university, there is often a lack of gentleness, nobility, sincerity and humanism, and an inspiring goal is missing in life.

The society, therefore, may have a high percentage of literates or educated people and yet there may be commotion in legislative bodies, disobedience to orders of the highest court of the land, total disregard for law, criminal tendencies and unsocial habits. One does not need lengthy explanation to understand that it is the aforesaid factors that create disharmony.

Education would, therefore, fulfill its noble objective only if it imparts teaching in such values that create harmonious personality and helps to maintain harmony in the society and man's harmony with nature, with the environment and with the self.

# Netaji's nationalism drove the British out

But the struggle and ideas of nationalism of Netaji have been limited to a paragraph in history textbooks

On September 12, 1944, from somewhere in Burma, a speech echoed and resonated in the minds of every Indian then and even till today. Netaji, in his revolutionary tone, commented: "We have resolved to create a united and free India, therefore, we shall oppose all attempts to divide her and cut her into bits."

And after almost 78 years, a statue of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was installed at the historic India Gate and the path leading to India Gate has been recently named as the 'Kartavya Path'. The path not only camouflages the iconic Subhas Chandra Bose and his vision of modern India, but also instills in the minds of every Indian, the primary duty to uphold the democratic principles incorporated in the legislature, the executive and the judiciary. It also ignites the spirit among the countrymen that India should always be united and dream of living in a free India and in the process, dedicate their lives in the establishment of India as a country that the entire globe views as a symbol of patriotism and unity in diversity.

The sense of nationalism that Netaji bore in his heart since his childhood and the activities that he carried on for the territory of India till his last breath, make him an iconic statesman.

Netaji, since his young age, was a socially conscious individual and during his days in the Presidency College in Kolkata. He was disturbed by the poverty and hardship that were faced by the people then. It was his sense of equality for all individuals that even made him question his stay at a three storied residence when he saw many beggars not having a roof over their head. And that made him even question the system of governance that created luxuries for a few but poverty for many.

That was his sense of nationalism for India that he envisioned even before India acquired her independence from the colonial rule. Nationalism for Bose was a transparent story of freedom for every individual where no one was dominated, and each and every individual had the equal amount of respect and liberty without any power expressing authority over them. This notion of nationalism that Bose had in his mind was visible in the events where he remained a witness to.

The history on Netaji depicts a story of his travel in a tram where he saw an Englishman sitting with his feet up, while an Indian gentleman was sitting in front of him. The Indian gentleman because of the fear of the colonial dominance did not raise his voice to it. But Bose was infuriated by this act of the Englishman and as such he asked him to put his foot down as he was spoiling the clothes of the Indian gentleman. The

British man replied to Bose stating that the Indian can leave the seat if he had any problem with his foot being up. This made Bose very angry and seeing his rebellious nature towards establishing equality in the society, united the other Indians on the tram, and all joined Bose in the process of rebuking the Englishman.

However, Netaji's desire to establish a society free of dominance faced a setback when the Indian person who suffered from the act of the Englishman got down at the next station, so as to avoid more ugly scenes. On the one hand, it was that nationalistic approach of Bose that portrayed glimpses of Indian unity, but on the other hand, it was the clutches of dominance from which the Indians never imagined they could get out, jolted Bose briefly in his dream of establishing a free India.

Bose figured out the process of uniting a section of the Indians when he realised that it was not non-violence but armed rebellion that would prompt the British to leave India. The sense of nationalism was also visible when he in his bold voice, gave the call for 'Dilli Chalo' in his iconic Indian National Army movement as well as the immortal quote of 'You give me blood, and I will give you freedom'.

National Security Advisor of India Ajit Doval, in one of his speeches relating to Bose, stated that the British left India not because of Mahatma Gandhi, but because of the rise in nationalism and the spark Netaji created among the soldiers of Indian Army in the form of INA. Such was the aura of INA that even prompted the deeply loyal British Indian Army, Navy and Air Force to join hands in the fervour and energy that was unleashed by INA.

The impact of Netaji leading the Indian National Army was so strong that it not only acted as an opposite Indian force against the British, to which the Indian National Congress and the Muslim League had fallen prey, but it also led to the British wanting his immediate detention.

A visionary ahead of his time, Netaji was not only successful in raising the notion of Nation over community, religion and tribe but he also clearly understood the concept of diplomacy and foreign relations and he rightly applied the 'Chanakya Neeti' that speaks of "Enemy of an enemy is your friend"; and this principle helped him to form alliance with Germany and Italy, against the British and as a result of which he was successful in strengthening

the concept of military force in India in the form of INA.

A pragmatic nationalist who respected divergent approaches and views, Netaji understood the soul of the Indian nation and as such, he envisioned a strong central government with a large amount of autonomy allowed to the minority communities and the provinces. Therefore, for these reasons, Netaji's birthday in India, recently has also been tagged as 'Parakram Diwas'.

Netaji's idea of nationalism revolved around the concepts of equality, liberty and justice, individual freedom and balance of power and more importantly his nationalism for India laid in the concept of establishing India as a nation with complete overhauling and recasting of the stereotypical mode of existence, leading to genuine national solidarity that would in the longer run, give India the position of glory. He also believed that a Nation has no right to exist if it has no ambition, but he also emphasised on the fact that progress of a country should be broader and for the community as a whole rather than for fulfilling selfish ends.

# The Third Front again divides Opposition leaders

A weakened Congress is not a threat to regional satraps but their ambition stops them from including it in their coalition

Third Front again! Before every Lok Sabha poll, the Third Front idea is floated, and the 2024 polls are no exception. Political pundits predict that there is space for the entire Opposition against Bharatiya Janata Party but not a Third Front, as it will splinter the anti-BJP votes and help the ruling dispensation. The concept was tried and tested in 1977, 1989, and 1996-98, supported by either Congress or the BJP. But they were all short-lived.

Some regional satraps led by Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrashekhara Rao are trying to build a Third Front before the 2024 Lok Sabha polls. It includes some influential regional leaders heading BRS, AAP, CPI-M, Trinamool Congress, and the

Samajwadi party. They want a coalition minus Congress to fight the BJP.

Parallely, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi is also currently on a Bharat Jodo Yatra to unite the Opposition parties. In effect, while Rahul wants to lead the Opposition, regional leaders prefer a front minus Congress.

Many ifs and buts are there for forging a Third Front. Since the 1980s, regional forces like SP, BSP, RJD, and JD(U) have emerged and had a stronghold in their respective states. Whether these leaders would come together to challenge Prime Minister Narendra Modi is the million-dollar question. Moreover, historically, arithmetic has shown the Third Front is only possible with the support of either

the Congress or the BJP.

With its glorious past but miserable present, a weakened Congress is currently attempting to save the party. With this in view, Rahul Gandhi is being rebranded before the 2024 polls. He has undertaken a Bharat Jodo Yatra to unite the secular forces.

The grand old party has invited 21 Opposition parties, including the Samajwadi Party and the CPM, for the concluding ceremony in Kashmir next month.

Rao floated his Third Front idea in early 2018, arguing that the Congress and the BJP have failed to govern the country. In KCR's mind, he and not Modi or the Congress could lead the country in the right direction. He tried to

build a non-Congress, non-BJP front ahead of the 2019 general election. But it failed, with most regional leaders stopping at extending only moral support.

In a show of strength to boost his political ambitions, KCR held a mega public rally in Khammam on January 18. The rally was the first after KCR converted his regional party Telangana Rashtra Samithi to Bharat Rashtra Samithi on October 5 last year. To KCR's delight, the Election Commission has recognised the BRS as a national party.

Most of those who skipped the Congress Yatra participated in the Khammam Rally. It included Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, his Punjab counterpart Bhagwant

Mann, Kerala CM Pinarayi Vijayan, Samajwadi Party leader Akhilesh Yadav, and CPI's D Raja. KCR has also opened back-channel communication with Odisha's Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, to join the alliance.

KCR is opposed to the Congress as the two parties are political rivals in Telangana. That is why he aspires to head a non-Congress, non-BJP front. Interestingly, he organised the Khammam meeting days ahead of the grand finale of the Bharat Jodo Yatra later this month in Kashmir.

KCR has never hidden his ambition for a national role while waiting to perform a hat trick in the Assembly polls later this year. He believes he is destined to become a national alternative to Modi.

However, after two consecutive terms since 2014, KCR has faced an anti-incumbency wave. Though he has finished off the Congress and the TDP in the state, to his dismay, the BJP has emerged as the main Opposition party in the state. He depends upon Dame Luck smiling at him.

A big question remains: will the Third Front aspirants manage to capture any space in national politics or match Modi's popularity with their king-size egos? Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, who is realistic, believes that "there is no question of a Third Front. There should be one front that includes Congress. Then we can trounce the BJP in 2024."

The Opposition has to decide who their real rival is. Is it the BJP or the Congress?

## Finland's top diplomat hints at joining NATO without Sweden

Finland's top diplomat appeared to suggest Tuesday that the country may have to consider joining NATO without Sweden after Turkey's president cast serious doubt on the expansion of the military alliance. "We still have to evaluate the situation if it turns out that Sweden's application is stalling for a long time to come," Foreign Minister Pekka Haavisto told Finnish broadcaster YLE. His comment came a day after Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan warned Sweden not to expect support for its bid for NATO membership following weekend protests in Stockholm by an anti-Islam activist and pro-Kurdish groups. It was the first time a leading government official in either country had appeared to raise doubts about joining the alliance together. Haavisto later backpedalled, telling reporters in Parliament that his comment earlier Tuesday had been "imprecise" and that Finland's ambition to join NATO jointly with Sweden remained unchanged. He said he had spoken with NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg, who had stressed to Haavisto that the military bloc would like to see the two Nordic nations join simultaneously. "But of course there have been raised concerns within NATO on how the (recent) incidents in Sweden will affect the schedule," Haavisto said.

## ‘Serbia faces global isolation over Kosovo’

Serbia could face international isolation and economic decline if it rejects a new Western plan for normalising relations with its former wartime foe Kosovo, the Balkan country's president Aleksandar Vucic said on Monday, in what appeared to be a shift from his previous headline rhetoric. Serbia received that warning last week during a visit by a group of US and European envoys who have stepped up efforts to defuse longtime tensions in the volatile Balkan region amid Russia's invasion of Ukraine. "Serbia must talk, take part in dialogue and continue its European road," Vucic said. "We would be economically and politically lost without it and, as a president, I would not agree to lead the country that is alone and isolated."

The dispute between Serbia and its former province of Kosovo has remained a source of instability in the Balkans long after the 1998-99 war, which ended with a NATO intervention that forced Serbia to pull out of the territory. Kosovo in 2008 declared independence from Serbia, which Belgrade has refused to recognise, relying on Russia and China to help Serbia maintain its claim over the territory. The US and EU have been pushing forward an EU-mediated dialogue that has been stalled for months because they fear Russia, a Serbia ally, could try to stir instability in the Balkans to avert attention from the war in Ukraine. "These talks were among the toughest in the past decade," Vucic added, describing the meeting. "It was never like this." The West wants to defeat Russia and anyone standing in the way will be "swept away," Vucic said. The US and EU have been pushing forward an EU-mediated dialogue that has been stalled for months because they fear Russia, a Serbia ally, could try to stir instability in the Balkans to avert attention from the war in Ukraine. # 7 dead as California mourns 3rd mass killing in 8 days

## 1 killed, houses damaged as earthquake jolts Nepal

A gunman killed seven people at two agricultural businesses in Northern California, plunging the state into mourning again in the wake of its third mass killing in eight days.

Officers arrested a suspect in Monday's shootings, 67-year-old Chunli Zhao, after they found him in his car in the parking lot of a sheriff's substation, San Mateo County Sheriff Christina Corpus said.

Seven people were found dead and an eighth injured at a farm and another location several miles away, the Sheriff's Office said. Officials believe Zhao worked at one of the facilities and that the victims were workers as well, Corpus said. Officials haven't determined a motive for the shooting.

California is still reeling from an attack on a Lunar New Year celebration in Monterey Park that killed 11 and cast a shadow over an important holiday for many Asian-American communities. Authorities are still seeking a motive for the Saturday shooting.

"For the second time in recent days, California communities are mourning the loss of loved ones in a senseless act



of gun violence," President Joe Biden said Tuesday morning. "Even as we await further details on these shootings, we know the scourge of gun violence across America requires stronger action."

The new year has brought six mass killings in the U.S. In fewer than three weeks, accounting for 39 deaths. Three have occurred in California since Jan. 16, according to a database compiled by The Associated Press, USA Today and Northeastern University. The database tracks every mass

killing — defined as four dead not including the offender — committed in the U.S. Since 2006.

The killings occurred on the outskirts of Half Moon Bay, a city about 30 miles (48 kilometers) south of San Francisco.

Half Moon Bay Vice Mayor Joaquin Jimenez said the victims included Chinese and Latino farmworkers. Some workers lived at one of the facilities and children may have witnessed the shooting, she said. Corpus said it wasn't immediately clear how the two locations were con-

nected.

The Sheriff's Office first received reports of a shooting in the afternoon and found four people dead and a fifth wounded at the first scene. Officers then found three more people fatally shot nearby, Capt. Eamonn Allen said in a news release.

About two hours later, a sheriff's deputy spotted Zhao's car parked outside a sheriff's substation in a strip mall and arrested him.

A video of the arrest showed three officers approaching a parked car with drawn weapons. Zhao got out of the car, and the officers pulled him to the ground, put him in handcuffs, and led him away. A weapon was found in his vehicle, officials said. The video was captured by Kati McHugh, a Half Moon Bay resident who witnessed the arrest.

The sheriff's department believes Zhao acted alone.

"We're still trying to understand exactly what happened and why, but it's just incredibly, incredibly tragic," said state Sen. Josh Becker, who represents the area and called it "a very close-knit" agricultural community.

Aerial television images showed police officers collecting evidence from a farm with dozens of greenhouses.

A 5.9-magnitude earthquake jolted Western Nepal on Tuesday, killing one person and damaging a number of houses in the region, officials said.

The earthquake, with epicentre in the Mela area of Bajura district in Sudurpaschim province, hit the region at 2:43 PM local time, said Lok Bijaya Adhikari, head of the Earthquake Measurement and Research Centre.

A 35-year-old woman was killed in Gaumul Rural Municipality-2 when a falling rock hit her while she was cutting grass in the nearby forest,

police said.

According to provincial police chief, the earthquake damaged a number of houses in Bajura and Bajhang districts.

Two houses were destroyed in Ward No. 7 and two other houses in Ward No. 9 of Badimalika Municipality of Bajura district, which is situated 450-km West of Kathmandu. A temple in the municipality also developed cracks, police said.

A landslide triggered by the earthquake resulted in the death of over 40 sheep, the police said, adding that one person was injured in the incident.

## Remains of 60 of Nepal crash victims handed over to relatives

Authorities in Nepal have handed to relatives the bodies of 60 of the 72 people killed in a plane crash last week, the airline said. Rescuers were still searching for two bodies at the site where a Yeti Airlines flight with 72 on board crashed on Jan. 15 at the resort town of Pokhara, 200 kilometers (125 miles) west of the capital, Kathmandu.

Among the 10 other bodies recovered, six have been identified and will be returned to relatives soon and four others still need to be identified, the airline said in a statement late Monday.

The twin-engine ATR 72-500 aircraft plummeted into a gorge as it was approaching Pokhara International Airport in the Himalayan foothills. The crash site is about 1.6 kilometers (1 mile) from the runway at an elevation of about 820 meters (2,700 feet).

While it's still not clear what caused the crash, some aviation experts say video taken from the ground of the plane's last moments indicated it went into a stall, although it's unclear why. Nepal's Civil Aviation Authority has also said the airport's instrument landing system will not be working until Feb. 26 — eight weeks after the airport began operations on Jan. 1.

# Enormous challenge to conduct local polls: Lankan official

It would be an "enormous challenge" for Sri Lanka to hold local polls in March as the country is facing a dire economic situation, a senior government official said on Tuesday.

Cabinet spokesman Bandula Gunawardena told reporters here the government would not be able to enhance the rationed fuel quotas for vehicles to be widely used in the election process.

"We have informed both the

election commission and the Supreme Court that holding of the election would be an enormous challenge," Gunawardena said.

He said both the state power entity Ceylon Electricity Board (CEB) and the Central Transport Board, whose buses would be pressed into service for the election process, are in very bad shape with the loss of revenue and resources.

Gunawardena said the government would not be able to enhance the rationed fuel quo-

tas for the vehicles. Currently, petrol is rationed at 20 litres per vehicle for a week.

Sri Lanka's election commission announced on Saturday it will hold the local council polls on March 9, ending speculation that the election may be postponed again due to the prevailing economic crisis in the country.

The local election for the 340 councils in the island nation had been due from March last year but was earlier postponed by six months due to an unpre-



cedented economic turmoil which triggered a political crisis and led to the ouster of former President Gotabaya Rajapaksa. The opposition parties have been pressing for the local election, saying it will give people a chance to show displeasure over the government's handling of the economic crisis.

The government, however, has delayed the local polls and said the time is not suitable to hold the election given the ongoing economic crisis in the country.

"This is not the time for an unimportant election such as the local election," said Vajira Abeywardena, a government member.

The election process will reportedly cost Rs 10 billion

which would put additional pressure on the already lean state finances.

The opposition groups say that the government was trying to postpone the election due to fear of a defeat.

# Rights group files suit in Germany against Myanmar military

A human rights group and 16 people from Myanmar have filed a criminal complaint in Germany seeking punishment of Myanmar's generals for genocide, war crimes and crimes against humanity they alleged were committed in that country after their 2021 government takeover and during a 2017 crackdown on Muslim Rohingya.

Fortify Rights, a complainant in the case announced Tuesday in Bangkok, noted "the individuals responsible for crimes related to both have yet to be held accountable."

The federal prosecutor's office in Germany, where the legal complaint was filed last Friday, declined to comment on it. The office would have to decide whether to file an indictment before the matter can go to court, a potentially lengthy process.

The actions of Myanmar's generals also are under investigation by the International Criminal



Court and in a genocide case at the International Court of Justice, also known as the World Court.

But activists seeking accountability also have filed cases in national courts in Argentina, Turkey and now Germany as well, under the concept of universal jurisdiction.

The legal principle allows prosecution for mass atrocities regardless of location or nationality when the offenses are so severe they represent crimes against the entire international community, said Matthew Smith, chief executive officer and co-founder at Fortify Rights.

"An investigation and subsequent prosecution of these crimes under German law would serve to punish those who have committed the gravest of crimes, prevent future crimes by perpetrators in Myanmar, and signal to other would-be perpetrators in Myanmar and elsewhere that accountability for atrocity crimes cannot be avoided," Fortify Rights said in a statement.

# Extreme Israeli group takes root in US with fundraising bid

An Israeli group raising funds for Jewish extremists convicted in some of the country's most notorious hate crimes is collecting tax-exempt donations from Americans, according to findings. The records in the case suggest that Israel's far right is gaining a new foothold in the United States.

The amount of money raised through a U.S. Nonprofit is not known. But the Associated Press and the Israeli investigative platform Shomrim have documented the money trail from New Jersey to imprisoned Israeli radicals who include Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin's assassin and people convicted in deadly attacks on Palestinians.

This overseas fundraising arrangement has made it easier for the Israeli group, Shlom Asiraich, to collect money from Americans, who can make their contributions through the U.S. Nonprofit with a credit card and claim a tax deduction.

Many Israeli causes, from hospitals to universities to charities, raise money through U.S.-based arms. But having the strategy adopted by a group assisting Jewish radicals raises legal and moral questions.

It also comes against the backdrop of a new, far-right government in Israel led by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, where ultranationalists and extremist lawmakers have gained unprecedented power.

## Turkey condemns Quran protest in the Netherlands

Turkey's foreign ministry said Tuesday it summoned the Dutch ambassador following a demonstration targeting Islam's holy book, days after a similar protest in Sweden tensed relations. Edwin Wagenveld, Dutch leader of the far-right Pegida movement in the Netherlands, on Sunday tore pages out of a copy of the Quran near the Dutch parliament and stomped on the pages. Police looked on but did not intervene.

"It is about freedom of expression and I think that should be possible in the Netherlands," Wagenveld said in a video posted on the site of Dutch newspaper Algemeen Dagblad. The Turkish foreign ministry said in its statement that it condemned the "vile attack," which it said was proof of Islamophobia, discrimination and xenophobia in Europe.

The ministry told the Dutch ambassador they expected concrete precautions to prevent and not permit similar demonstrations in the future, and that authorities take action against Wagenveld.

# VC investment in Indian startups fell 38% in 2022

Venture capital (VC) investments in Indian startups plunged over 38 per cent in 2022 as economic uncertainty and market volatility affected fundraising and investment activities, GlobalData said on Tuesday.

In a statement, GlobalData said an analysis of its financial deals database reveals that “a total of 1,726 VC funding deals worth \$20.9 billion were announced in India in 2022 compared to 1,715 deals worth \$33.8 billion in 2021.”

“The ongoing economic uncertainty and market volatility continue to affect the fundraising and investment activities in India and subsequently VC investment in the country startups suffered a massive year-on-year 38.2 per cent decline in value terms during 2022,” the data and analytics company said.

Aurojyoti Bose, lead analyst at GlobalData, said India is a key Asia-Pacific market and stands just next to China in terms of VC funding deals by volume and value.

It is also among the top four markets (the US, the UK, China and India) globally.

India accounted for 5.1 per cent and 6.3 per cent share of global VC funding value and



volume, respectively, in 2022.

While the US, the UK and China registered decline in VC funding deal volume in 2022 compared to the previous year, India stood out as a notable exception and registered 0.6 per cent growth.

“Although India’s VC funding deal volume has slightly increased year-on-year, the significant drop in VC funding value seems to be a fallout of growing investor cautiousness over startup valuations. Moreover, volatile market conditions and recession fears seem to have forced many investors to preserve capital. The restrictions on travel and in-person meetings also made it more difficult for VC firms to conduct due diligence on potential investments,” Bose said.

The average size of VC funding deals, which stood at \$19.7 million in 2021 fell to \$12.1 million in 2022. The number of VC deals valued more than or equal to \$100 million announced in India stood at 42 in 2022 as compared to 86 during the previous year.

“The decrease in venture capital investment can also be attributed to the lack of companies that can generate significant returns for investors. This is a common challenge for emerging economies, and India is no exception,” Bose added.

GlobalData said historic data may change in case some deals get added to previous months because of a delay in the disclosure of information in the public domain.

# Finance Min meets private sector bankers

## Reviews progress of various financial inclusion schemes

The Finance Ministry on Tuesday held a meeting with private sector lenders to review progress made by them under the flagship financial inclusion and social security schemes.

“Dr. Vivek Joshi, Secretary DFS chaired a meeting today with the representatives of Private Sector Banks, Small Finance Banks and Payment Banks to review the progress made by them under various Financial Inclusion initiatives (PMJDY, PMJJBY, PMSBY, APY, PM SVANidhi, etc.),” Department of Financial Services said in a tweet.

Last week, Joshi met heads of public sector banks and urged them to achieve targets under various schemes for current financial year.

During the meeting, progress of various social secu-



rity (Jan Suraksha) schemes, including Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY), Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY), Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY), Atal Pension Yojana (APY), Pradhan Mantri MUDRA and Prime Minister Street Vendor’s AtmaNirbhar Nidhi (PMSVANidhi), and Agri credit etc, were reviewed.

Indian Banks’ Association (IBA) has already been requested to expedite the Consumer Service Rating for all Scheduled Commercial Banks to gauge the consumer expectation and enable banks to raise their standards of services delivery to every segment.

# Vistara to add 70 planes in fleet by mid-2024: CEO Vinod Kannan

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Full service carrier Vistara will continue to expand and expects to have a total of 70 planes by mid-2024, its chief Vinod Kannan said on Tuesday.

The airline, a joint venture between Tata Sons and Singapore Airlines, reported an operating profit for the first time since inception in the three months ended December 2022.

By the middle of next year, Kannan said it will have a total of 70 aircraft, including 7 Boeing 787s.

Out of the total 70 planes, there will also be 10 A321s and 53 A320 neos, the Vistara CEO said at a briefing.

Among the 53 A320 neos, 10 planes will have all economy class and the rest will have three classes. Currently, the airline has a fleet of 53 aircraft.

“We will continue to expand... More international



routes (will be added),” Kannan said.

Without disclosing the exact profit figure in the December quarter, the airline also said it crossed the \$1 billion revenue mark and remained EBITDA positive in the current fiscal year.

EBITDA refers to Earnings

Before Interest, Taxes, Depreciation and Amortisation.

“For the first time since inception, the airline reported a net profit (excluding unrealised foreign currency loss and non-operating income) for the quarter ended December 2022,” Vistara said.

# Rupee falls 28 paise to 81.70 against US dollar

The rupee fell 28 paise to close at 81.70 (provisional) against the US dollar on Tuesday as unabated foreign fund outflow hit market sentiments.

However, a weak dollar and fall in crude prices capped the losses in the local currency, forex traders said.

At the interbank foreign exchange market, the rupee opened lower at 81.61 to a dollar against the previous close of 81.42. The local unit moved in a range of 81.43 to 81.76 during the day.

On Monday, the rupee had declined by 25 paise to close at 81.42 against the US dollar.

Meanwhile, the US dollar index, which gauges the greenback’s strength against a basket of six currencies, declined 0.01 per cent to 102.15 amid con-



cerns over US economic growth.

The Brent crude was trading 0.41 per cent lower at \$87.83 per barrel.

On the domestic equity market front, the 30-share BSE Sensex ended almost flat at 60,978.75, up 37.08 points or 0.06 per cent. The broader NSE Nifty inched up 0.25 points to 18,118.30.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) were net sellers in the capital market on Monday as they sold shares worth ₹219.87 crore, according to exchange data.

# Ex-Sebi chief Damodaran launches midcap corp governance index ATOM

Airawat Indices Pvt Ltd, a joint venture firm founded by former Sebi Chairman M Damodaran and Decimal Point Analytics, has launched a new index ATOM, comprising 30 midcap companies listed on stock exchanges.

ATOM (Airawat Touchstone MidCap Index) is a thematic index designed to serve investors seeking to invest in “well-governed mid-cap companies”, the company said in a release.

The joint venture has selected these 30 midcap com-

panies from the AMFI’s (Association of Mutual Funds in India) list of midcap 150 stocks as the starting point of its scoring methodology.

Damodaran, former Chairman of UTI and IDBI, also announced a Corporate Governance Index for midcap companies.

The methodology to select the 30 companies in ATOM captures the financial quality and corporate governance standards of the AMFI midcap universe, it said, adding the index is reconstituted every six months based on revisions AMFI makes to its list of 150



midcap companies.

Speaking at the launch of ATOM, Damodaran said: “The midcap space is conventionally thought to be risky and full of dodgy companies. However, we decided to explode this myth and found a way to systematically identify well-gov-

erned companies to create ATOM.”

He further said with the rapid growth of asset management services in India, having a handful of index providers may prove to be insufficient.

“Airawat, as a new entrant, is committed to finding new and innovative segments in the markets and creating indices around which investors can build unique portfolios,” he said.

Ashutosh Bishnoi, Advisor to Airawat and a former Board member of the Association of Mutual Funds of India, said ATOM represents the best

quality of midcap companies in India.

“On a CAGR basis, it outperformed the 150 midcap stocks over the last five years by over 500 bps and yet significantly underperformed over the last one year,” he said.

# Total toll collection through FASTag grew 46% to ₹50K crore in 2022: NHAI

Total toll collection through FASTag on fee plazas, including state highway toll plazas, increased 46 per cent to ₹50,855 crore in 2022, state-owned NHAI said on Tuesday.

Total toll collection through FASTag on fee plazas, including state highway toll plazas, in 2021 was ₹34,778 crore.

The average daily toll collection through FASTag on NH fee plazas in December 2022 was ₹134.44 crore, and the single day highest collection touched ₹144.19 crore on December 24, 2022, the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) said in a statement.

Similarly, the statement said the number of FASTag transactions also witnessed a growth of about 48 per cent year-on-year in 2022.

The number of FASTag transactions in 2021 and 2022

was 219 crore and 324 crore, respectively, it added.

The statement said with 6.4 crore FASTags issued as of date, the total number of FASTag-enabled fee plazas across the country also grew to 1,181 (including 323 state highway fee plazas) in 2022 from 922 in the previous year 2021.

FASTag implementation has reduced the waiting time at NH Fee Plazas significantly.

A FASTag allows a user to pay the highway fee electronically without having to stop at the toll collection booths set up by the highway operators.

Since February 16, 2021, the government has made FASTag mandatory for all private as well as commercial vehicles.

As per the rules, vehicles that do not have a valid or functional FASTag must pay double the toll charge as a penalty.

# Sensex, Nifty trim gains to close flat amid volatile trade

Benchmark Sensex trimmed barely gains to close marginally higher while Nifty settled flat in choppy trade on Tuesday as gains in auto shares were offset by selling pressure in banking and energy shares.

The 30-share BSE barometer closed slightly up by 37.08 points or 0.06 per cent to 60,978.75, with 15 of its stocks ending in green and the rest in red. The index opened higher and gained over 300 points to a high of 61,266.06 in early trade.

The index, however, dropped over 400 points from the day’s high to touch a low of 60,849.12 due to selling in select counters.

The broader NSE Nifty closed flat at 18,118.30 with 29 of its shares ending in red and 21 in green. The 50-issue index touched a high of 18,201.25 and a low of 18,078.65 in the day trade.

“Mirroring robust global peers, the domestic market extended previous gains driven by auto stocks. However, due to



selling pressure in banking shares, the indices anchored close to the flatline,” Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services, said.

Auto stocks were in focus prior to the earnings results of the sector major Maruti Suzuki India. Hopes of a soft landing of the US economy along with the anticipation of a lesser rate hike boosted global bourses, Nair said.

Among major gainers, Tata Motors rose the most by 3.26 per cent.

Maruti Suzuki India rose by 3.23 per cent after its post-

ed a two-fold jump in net profit for the December quarter on robust sales.

HCL Tech, HDFC twins, Asian Paints, IndusInd Bank, TCS and ITC were among the gainers.

Axis Bank declined 2.43 per cent a day after it reported its financial results. L&T, Reliance Industries, SBI, Kotak Bank, Tata Steel and Power Grid were major losers.

Ajit Mishra, VP - Technical Research, Religare Broking Ltd said that stock markets ended almost unchanged in a volatile trading session in continuation

of the prevailing consolidation phase.

Auto and IT shares advanced while metal, realty and pharma declined.

In the broader market, BSE Midcap declined 0.3 per cent to 25,038.24 and Smallcap dropped 0.43 per cent to 28,422.45.

Among sectoral indices, BSE Metal fell by 1.21 per cent, Healthcare by 1.01 per cent, Realty by 0.95 per cent, Utilities by 0.82 per cent, Power by 0.78 per cent and capital goods by 0.75 per cent.

On the other hand, BSE Auto gained 1.17 per cent, IT by 0.66 per cent, Consumer Discretionary by 0.71 per cent and Consumer Durables by 0.51 per cent.

Asian stock markets were also higher following overnight gains in US markets on expectations that the Federal Reserve will trim its rate hikes to tamp down inflation.

Tokyo’s Nikkei 225 index gained 1.5 per cent and Australia’s S&P/ASX 200 rose 0.4 per cent. Many markets in Asia were closed for the Lunar New Year holidays.

# ‘Family issues pose great threat to small, medium family enterprises’

**Mumbai:** A study released by Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan’s SP Jain Institute of Management and Research (SPIJMR) has found that small and medium family enterprises have less to worry about from the business side. Instead, family issues may prove to be the proverbial Achilles’ heel for such businesses.

The study, titled ‘India: State of the Family Business Report’, undertaken by SPIJMR’s Centre for Family Business & Entrepreneurship (CFBE), involved a survey of 350 family businesses across India over May-October 2022, conducted by Hansa Research.

It found that most small and medium family enterpris-

es have reported either stable or increasing trends across various parameters such as sales, market share, profitability, number of people employed, and profit margin on sales in FY 2021-22.

This would be in line with the provisional estimates released by the National Statistical Office (NSO), which reported that the Indian economy had fully recovered to its pre-pandemic levels of 2019-20, with the real GDP growth rate estimated at 8.7% in 2021-2022.

The sentiments regarding their competitiveness in the past three years and their future expectations regarding growth and adoption of technology

remain optimistic for these small and medium family enterprises, even though expectations regarding cost increases run high.

Microenterprises reported better business performance than other small and medium enterprise peers.

Most microenterprises reported stable or increasing sales, market shares, profitability, Return on Assets, Return on Equity, and profit margins compared to medium enterprises. These enterprises also reported employing a greater or the same number of people as before.

More service sector enterprises reported improvement in business parameters such as



sales, market share, profitability, number of people employed, and profit margin on sales compared to manu-

facturing enterprises and thus outperformed them.

It is on the family side that family businesses face the most

significant challenge. While the FBs are governed by clear values and a code of conduct, there is less attention paid to critical aspects such as family governance and planning for succession.

This manifests in unclear succession timing, despite an intent to hand over the business to the next-gen family member and a reluctance to let go due to the perceived inability or lack of interest in the next-gen family members.

“Our survey reveals that despite a seemingly difficult and uncertain business environment, small and medium family businesses seem less pressurized by business developments.

In fact, family businesses will face greater headwinds from the family side than from the business side, with issues of succession and governance looming large and threatening their business performance.

Our survey also sounds a warning bell to family businesses in India- the most common form of business organization.

Family Businesses will need to put their family in order, so that they can reap the benefits of an improving business environment,” said Dr Tulsi Jayakumar, Executive Director, CFBE and author of the report.

Pointing to the difficulties of succession planning - a key

section of the survey, Dr Jayakumar added: “Management schools and consultants will need to train the senior generation family members of the importance of ‘letting go’ in order to preserve the family business they have invested so much in.

Many of the respondents among the senior gen in our survey expressed their intent to continue running the business as long as they could.

This would of course demotivate the talented and independent among the next-gen.

Transgenerational entrepreneurship can be fostered only through paying sufficient attention to family dynamics.”



# RYBAKINA, KHACHANOV REACH AUS OPEN SF

Big-serving Elena Rybakina blasted her way into the Australian Open semi-finals on Tuesday, while Karen Khachanov followed suit in the men's draw after Sebastian Korda suffered a wrist injury.

In the first quarter-final on day nine at Melbourne Park, Moscow-born Kazakh Rybakina stepped up her bid for a second Grand Slam title with a ruthless 6-2, 6-4 win over Jelena Ostapenko.

She will face American third seed Jessica Pegula or two-time Australian Open champion Victoria Azarenka in the last four.

The 23-year-old Rybakina sent down 11 aces to blow former French Open champion Ostapenko off Rod Laver Arena in 79 minutes.

The 22nd seed has blasted 35 aces so far, more than any other woman at the tournament.

Ominously, she said her serve is better now than when she won Wimbledon last year.

"I gained even more power. It's my weapon on the court and of course we are trying to work on it," she said, before adding: "Always a lot to improve."

The first men's quarter-final had been warming up nicely until Korda hurt his wrist against Russia's Khachanov.

The 18th seed went through when the young American retired in the third set, down 7-6 (7/5), 6-3, 3-0.

Khachanov's reward is a clash with either Greek third seed Stefanos Tsitsipas or unseeded Czech Jiri Lehecka, who play later, for a spot in Sunday's final.

Tsitsipas is the highest remaining seed in the draw after a series of shock exits.

The 22-year-old Korda, who had been attempting to emulate his father Petr's Australian Open victory in 1998, said afterwards that he could barely hold the racquet.

He said he first felt the injury while playing the Adelaide International this month, where he made the final and forced a championship point before being beaten by Novak Djokovic.

But it had not bothered him in

the opening four rounds at Melbourne Park until he hit a return in the second set.

"I had it in Adelaide and then it went away completely. Now it just came back out of nowhere," he said. "I have never had any wrist issues before."

"I'm looking forward to the semi-finals here in Australia for the first time."

Jeevan Nedunchezhiyan and N Sriram Balaji had reached the second round before bowing out.

No Indian featured in men's singles competition.

## Kyrgios targets March return

Inter remain third, a point behind AC Milan who play at Lazio on Tuesday, and level on points with Roma.

Napoli are the runaway leaders, 12 points clear at the top.

In Monday's other game Bologna were held to a 1-1 draw by bottom side Cremonese.

## Kane sinks Fulham to become Spurs' joint record scorer

Antonio Conte vowed to "win something" with Harry Kane after the striker became Tottenham's joint record scorer as his 266th goal for the club sealed a vital 1-0 win against Fulham on Monday.

England captain Kane netted on the stroke of half-time with a clinical strike from the edge of the penalty area at Craven Cottage.

Jimmy Greaves' Tottenham record had stood since 1970, but Kane's first goal in his last three appearances gave him a share of the historic milestone.

Kane played despite being ill with a fever and Tottenham boss Conte admitted he is desperate to reward the selfless star with silverware. Without a major trophy for club and country, Kane has been linked with Manchester United.

But Conte said: "Today he was amazing. I think he scored a fantastic goal, the execution, to control the ball, then to kick it in that way, only a world-class striker can score this goal."

"About the spirit that I spoke before, I want to underline Harry played with a fever and he was not so good, but he wanted to play because he understood the moment."

"He understood he is a point of reference for us. For sure, I would like to help him and me, also his team-mates, to try to do something important,



to win something with Tottenham because he loves Tottenham. "Tottenham is in his heart and it should be good if together we were able to win something, because then it is important to have this record, but I think it could be more important if you win a trophy."

Kane could break Greaves' record in Tottenham's next match in the FA Cup fourth round at second tier Preston on Saturday. It is only a matter of time before Kane takes sole possession of Tottenham's most hallowed record.

That remarkable achievement would have seemed impossible during a difficult start to his career that featured several failed loan spells before he finally emerged as a star.

Greaves, who died aged 81 in 2021, is regarded as one of the most natural goal scorers in football history. A member of England's 1966 World Cup-winning squad, who netted 44 times for his country, Greaves is the highest scorer in English top-flight history with 357 goals.

For Kane to be alongside such a legendary player is a tribute to his predatory instincts and his perseverance.

The 29-year-old is now one short of becoming the third player to net 200 Premier League goals, after Alan Shearer (260) and Wayne Rooney (208).

Kane also drew level with Rooney as England's joint record goalscorer after bagging his

## FOREST WILL ATTACK MAN UTD: COOPER

"Fernando Santos is a coach with a very good resume... successes... and work experience with huge stars," Bortniczuk



said on Twitter.

Former England and Liverpool midfielder Steven Gerrard had also been linked with the position.

Santos, 68, will succeed Czeslaw Michniewicz, who was

sacked last month following a last-16 appearance at the World Cup in Qatar.

Kylian Mbappe became the first Paris Saint-Germain player to score five times in one match as the Ligue 1 giants crushed sixth-tier amateur minnows Pays de Cassel 7-0 in the French Cup on Monday.

Mbappe, who scored a hat-trick in France's defeat by Argentina in the World Cup final just over a month ago, netted a hat-trick in the first half here as PSG led 4-0 at the break against their regional league opponents.

He struck twice more after the restart, with Neymar and Carlos Soler scoring PSG's other goals in the last-32 tie.

The Qatar-owned club, who have won the French Cup 14 times, more than any other team, will now play away to bitter rivals Marseille in the last 16 early next month. That match is scheduled



for the week beginning February 6, just a week before PSG host Bayern Munich in the first leg of their Champions League last-16 tie. "Once we scored the first goal it became harder for our opponents," PSG boss Christophe Galtier told reporters.

"The opponents we'll face over the next weeks are of a different quality," he added. Mbappe was given the captain's armband while Neymar also started, but Lionel Messi was rested, allowed to sit out this tie played before a full house at the 38,000-seat Stade Bollaert-Delelis in Lens.

Pays de Cassel are a tiny club representing a handful of villages inland from the port town of Dunkirk in France's far north, but their remarkable run to this stage of the tournament stoked the interest of the whole region.

They performed admirably in the early stages against the

Ligue 1 leaders, but their resistance was broken just before the half-hour mark when Mbappe turned in a Nuno Mendes cut-back, the ball taking a crucial deflection on its way in.

Mbappe then set up Neymar for the Brazilian to score his first goal since the World Cup, before the France star lobbed in his team's third and then completed a 12-minute hat-trick from a Vitinha pass.

Mbappe's fourth, and PSG's fifth, followed a goalkeeping mistake in the 56th minute.

Neymar set up Soler to backheel in for 6-0 before Mbappe completed the rout, his fifth of the game allowing him to equal the all-time record for most French Cup goals.

He has now scored 29 times in the competition, as many as former Marseille great Jean-Pierre Papin.



# INDIA WHITEWASH BLACK CAPS

Rohit Sharma scored his first ODI hundred in three years while Shubman Gill continued his domination with another sublime ton as India completed a clean sweep with a 90-run win over New Zealand in the third match here on Tuesday.

Batters from both sides lit up the dead rubber as 680 runs were scored at the Holkar Stadium.

Rohit (101 off 85 balls) got to the three-figure mark for the first time since January 2020 while Gill (112 off 78) scored his fourth ODI hundred to take India to 385 for nine.

Following twin failures, the

New Zealand top-order put up a much better show. Devon Conway (138) stitched crucial partnerships but Shardul Thakur (3/45) and Kuldeep Yadav (3/62) regularly struck to bowl out the Black Caps for 295 in 41.2 overs.

It was India's second consecutive clean sweep, having beaten Sri Lanka last week. After Hardik Pandya (1/37) got rid of Finn Allen (0), Conway shared 106 runs with Henry Nicholls and 78 runs with Daryl Mitchell (24). In the absence of Mohammed Shami and Mohammed Siraj, the Indian bowlers struggled initially, leaking runs as Conway tonked the ball all around the park.

Shardul, however, managed

to turn the game, as he took back-to-back wickets of Mitchell and Tom Latham (0) in the 26th over. In his next over, Thakur sent Glenn Phillips (5) packing with a cross-seamed delivery.

Umran Malik (1/52) then got Conway as the centurion pulled awkwardly with Rohit doing the rest at midwicket as the match seemed to slip out of New Zealand's grasp.

The spin duo of Kuldeep and Yuzvendra Chahal (2/43) then cleaned up the tail.

Earlier, Rohit and Gill put up a belligerent 212-run opening stand, sharing 22 fours and 11 sixes between them.

Rahul Dravid joked on the eve of the match that bowlers don't want to bowl as soon as

they land in Indore because of the batter-friendly conditions. The batting great had a point, and the New Zealanders rolling over their arms during the first 25 overs would have shared Dravid's sentiment.

At one point every ball that Rohit and Gill's bat touched was either flying to the boundary or over it. Gill hit four fours and a six to plunder 22 runs off Lockie Ferguson in the eighth over, symbolising the kind of form the 23-year-old has been in lately.

The youngster didn't have to even time the ball for it to run to the boundary. After three fours, he launched the short ball for an upper-cut six.

With the outfield quick and the wicket flat, the rather inex-

perienced New Zealand bowling unit had no answers to the Indian openers' carnage.

The 26th over saw both Rohit and Gill getting their centuries. Rohit pulled away to deep square to get to his mark and, three balls later, Gill got to the triple-figure mark, his third in four innings.

New Zealand skipper Tom Latham used as many as six bowlers and it was his sixth option — spinner Michael Bracewell — who provided the tourists their first breakthrough.

Trying to slog one out of the park, Rohit missed the ball as it kept low and turned to eventually hit the stumps. His wicket was met with a roar by the partisan crowd, welcoming Virat

Kohli (36).

A miscued shot in the next over spelt the end of Gill's innings as New Zealand struck twice in quick succession.

Ishan Kishan (17) didn't look too comfortable and took nine balls to open his account. A yes-no with Kohli, who had sprinted halfway, marked the end of the wicketkeeper batter's stay in the middle.

New Zealand were able to bring down the boundaries and sixes and, looking to play a big shot, Kohli couldn't beat Finn Allen at mid-off. Firmly on course for a 400-plus score, India endured a familiar middle-order batting collapse, before Hardik Pandya (54 off 38 balls) provided the final flourish.



## Don't understand why Oz isn't playing a tour game in India: Clarke

Former Australia captain Michael Clarke cannot fathom why Pat Cummins' side is not playing practice or tour games ahead of the Border-Gavaskar series, beginning in India on February 9.

Australia will be touring India for the four-Test series, with the opening game scheduled at Nagpur, and Clarke opined that not playing a tour game could have a "significant" impact on the outcome.

"That's the part (not playing tour games) I don't understand," Clarke was quoted as saying by Big Sports Breakfast on Tuesday.

"The no tour game before the first Test in India. I hope I'm proven wrong but I think that is going to be significant," Clarke, who played 115 Tests and scored more than 8,600 runs, added that playing 20-over or 50-over games in India was completely different from competing in the longest format, especially while countering spin.

"You need a completely different plan to what you have (been) playing in Australia, the way you start your innings against spin bowling, the way you play reverse swing, through the Australian summer we didn't see any reverse swing, the games were over in two, three days," he said.

Clarke added that the probability of India playing at least two spinner in the four-Test series could well favour them, given that the Australians are predominantly playing quick bowlers.

"So reverse swing is going to play a big part (in India), all these batters that walk out and play bowlers bowling 130-140kms — there's every chance India is going to play at least two spinners, so it's a completely different game."

Australia will likely arrive in India in the middle of next week, giving them around seven days to tune up for the gruelling series, and Clarke felt that wouldn't be enough.
