# Adani-sparked bloodbath Modify Indus Water continues; ₹10 L cr lost

Sensex closes lowest in past three months

PNS NEW DELHI

Investors lost more than ₹10.73 lakh crore in just two trading sessions as the continued selling in Adani groups stocks dragged the overall markets and triggered sell-offs in banking, financials, utilities and oil shares on Friday.

Adani group's shares came into bear grip on Wednesday itself following the Hindenburg report accusing the group of serious irregularities. Stock markets were closed on Thursday on account of Republic Day Republic Day.

Continuing its decline for a second session, the 30-share BSE benchmark tanked 874.16 points or 1.45 per cent, its biggest single day loss in more than a month, to settle at 59,330.90. This is the lowest closing level since October 21. During the day, Sensex plunged 1,230.36 points or 2.04 per cent to 58,974.70.

The broader NSE Nifty fell 287.60 points or 1.61 per cent to end at a three-month low of 17,604.35, also marking its worst single-day fall since December 23, 2022.



# **India 4th in world with ability** to develop Mach 6 missiles

Hypersonic Tech Demonstrator Vehicle tested; earlier only US, Russia, China had this capability PIONEER NEWS SERVICE ■ NEW DELHI

ndia on Friday carried out a Atest of indigenously designed Hypersonic Technology Demonstrator Vehicle (HSDTV) off the Odisha coast. This niche technology is only available with three other countries — the US, China and Russia.

It will enable development of hypersonic missiles which can travel at six times the speed of sound.

The Defence Research

and Development Organisation (DRDO) carried out the test. The DRDO had conducted three tests earlier in 2019, 2020 and 2021. The aim of the HSDTV project is to have a



scramjet engine which can fly at an altitude of 15 to 20 km. A scramjet engine (supersonic-combustion ramjet) is

one which can operate at hypersonic speeds.

Hypersonic missiles can travel at speeds faster than Mach 5 (five times the speed of sound) or 3,800 miles per hour, much faster than other ballistic and cruise missiles. They are highly manoeuvrable and do not follow a predictable arc as they travel. They can deliver conventional or nuclear pay-

loads within minutes. A Hypersonic Vehicle can be an airplane, missile, or

spacecraft.

The Indian hypersonic vehicle will take another three to four years to become fully operational.

In 2020, the DRDO successfully demonstrated the hypersonic air-breathing scramjet technology with the flight test of HSTDV.

With this successful

With this successful demonstration, many critical technologies such as aerodynamic configuration for hypersonic manoeuvers, use of scramjet propulsion for ignition and sustained combustion at hypersonic flow, thermo-structural characterisation of high temperature materials, separation mechanism at hypersonic velocities were

Apart from being used as a vehicle for hypersonic long-range cruise missiles, the HSTDV is a dual-use technology that will have multiple civilian applications, including the launching of small satellites

# 8 Cheetahs in Kuno to get dozen friends from South Africa

Eight cheetahs, which were brought from Namibia to India and released in Madhya Pradesh's Kuno National Park three months ago, may get 12 new "friends" from South Africa by mid-February, taking the total number of felines to 20

in the region.

India and South Africa recently signed a pact as a part of the former's much-ambitious Cheetah reintroduction programme. The eight big cats brought in September last year from Namibia are doing fine and making kills on their own, said the State officials.

According to reports, South Africa has donated 12 big cats to India. But India has to pay USD 3,000 for the capture of every cheetah to the African nation before they are translocated. Sources said that the MP Wildlife Department has already set up 10 quarantine facilities (enclosures) for them. In two of these facilities,

Due to the delay in the signing of the MoU for the inter-continental translocation of these big cats, some experts had last month expressed concern over the health of the South African cheetahs as these animals have been quarantined there since July 15. As a result of long quarantine, these animals might have lost their

# 4-year-old girl killed, two injured as six houses collapse in Agra

"A four-year-old girl has been killed," Additional District Magistrate Anjani Kumar Singh said on the phone. Uttar Pradesh Director General of Police (DGP) DS Chauhan said that rescue and relief work

# Padma Vibhushan to MSY to silence demand for Bharat Ratna: SP

 $T^{aken\ aback\ by\ the\ conferring\ of}_{Padma\ Vibhushan,\ India's\ second}$ highest civilian honour, posthumously on its founder Mulayam Singh Yadav, Samajwadi Party termed it as a "shrewd" move to reach out to the Yadav community, considered the core vote bank of the main opposition party in Uttar Pradesh.

Soon after the announcement of Padma Vibhushan award for late Mulayam Singh Yaday, senior SP leaders repeated an old demand that 'Netaji' (Mulayam), who died on October 10, 2022, should have been conferred the Bharat Ratna, the country's highest civilian honour, instead.

The SP also maintained that Padma Vibhushan award for Mulayam Singh Yadav was a ploy to "silence Bharat Ratna demand".

While the announcement of Padma Vibhushan for late Mulayam Singh Yadav has set the political rumour mills buzzing about the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party's outreach to the Yadav community, SP leaders accepted in private that the move was "shrewd politics" to "silence all voices of demands for Bharat Ratna" for 'Netaji' who was the "face of anti-communal" politics in Uttar Pradesh, a sharp contrast to the BJP whose resurgence in the state was marked with the Ram Janmabhoomi movement and the Rath

Hours after the announcement was made, Mainpuri MP and SP national president Akhilesh Yadav's wife Dimple Yadav, and his uncle Shivpal Singh Yadav repeated the demand for Bharat Ratna for 'Netaji'. Dimple and Akhilesh were in Saifai for Republic Day celebrations and flag

hoisting ceremony.
"'Netaji' will be conferred the Padma Vibhushan (by the government) but I think he should have got Bharat Ratna. And this honour should have come much earlier. It is our demand that Netaji be conferred the Bharat Ratna," Dimple said on Thursday. Shivpal Yadav said "Netaji had always raised the voice of farmers and the poor which is why the demand of all workers and supporters should be ful-

Samajwadi Party leaders admitted that the announcement was "not expected". They, however, said that the move did not come as a surprise as demand for Bharat Ratna for Netaji was raised even before his death and several party leaders had vociferously raised the demand after his death. After Mulayam's death, several SP

leaders had raised this demand. SP leader IP Singh had written a letter to the President of India after the death of Mulayam Singh Yadav, demanding the country's highest honour for 'Netaji'. He had also written to Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath that the Agra-Lucknow Expressway be named "Dhartiputra Mulayam Singh Yadav Expressway". Sambhal MLA Iqbal Mehmood had made a similar demand too. SP spokesperson Rajendra Chaudhary said that "the BJP has an agenda" and that "there was no talk of any such honour" for 'Netaji'.

However, insiders said that the

move had not come as a surprise.
"This is a shrewd move by the BJP. They want to ensure that the voices for Bharat Ratna for 'Netaji' were silenced and also continue their outreach to the Yadavs who are the core voters of the SP," a former SP MLA from the Yadav community said.

The SP leaders pointed out how the senior leadership of the BJP, including the chief minister and both the deputy chief ministers, had reached Saifai to pay homage to 'Netaji' after his death while Union Home Minister Amit Shah had reached Medanta hospital where Yadav remained admitted for days before his death.

From UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath to Union Jal Shakti Minister Swatantra Dev Singh, and BJP state president Bhupendra Singh Chaudhary, several party leaders, including Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, had visited Saifai then. "It was all politics... There was no emotion but only politics," a senior SP leader said.

According to the data from the national election study conducted by the Centre for the Study of Developing Societies (CSDS), while 53 per cent of the Yadavs had voted for the SP in 2014, the BJP had bagged as many as 27 per cent votes - the second highest -- from the community.

# BDC member murdered

In a sensational killing in Bulandshahr, some unknown miscreants barged into the house of a block development committee (BDC) member late Thursday night and killed her.

The victim was alone at home at the time of the incident. Her body was found lying in a pool of blood in the house on Friday morning. The assailants killed her by hitting her on the head with some heavy object.

As soon as the incident was reported, the police and forensic team reached the spot and started investigating the case.

According to information, the son of the deceased BDC member Ramvati Devi is posted in the UP Police as a subinspector. The husband of the deceased woman had gone to a wedding ceremony when the incident took place. When the husband returned home late at night, the door was locked. Even after making a lot of noise, the wife did not open the door. Then somehow he entered the house and saw his wife was lying in a pool of blood. He immediately informed the police about it.

As soon as the information was received, top police officers Superintendent of Police Shlok

Kumar, Superintendent of Police (City) Surendra Nath Tiwari reached the spot and questioned some people. After taking the statement from the husband of the deceased, the body was sent for post-

The son of the deceased woman is a sub-inspector and is posted in Etawah. The police are probing the motive behind the murder and who the killers

SSP Shlok Kumar said that the killing took place in Raina village located in Agauta area of Bulandshahr. He said the assailant would be arrested soon. All the CCTV footage of the area is being scanned. Forensic team has collected samples from the spot.

Meanwhile, a 20-year-old son of a local journalist in Pratapgarh district was bludgeoned to death with an iron rod by unidentified men, police

Vishal Pandey is the son of journalist Umesh Pandey who works with a Hindi newspaper. The victim, a resident of Ror village, was allegedly hit by a car and then beaten to death with an iron rod under "suspicious circumstances" in Atarsui Badli ka Purwa village, about 50 km from the district headquarters, on Wednesday night.

Police suspect old animosity between the accused and

the victim's father as the motive behind the gruesome murder. A senior police official said that the victim's family filed a complaint and a case had been registered against seven people, including former village head, Rang Bahadur.

He said that SP Satpal Antil had suspended police station in-charge Avan Dixit for laxity in duty. The victim's body was sent for post-mortem and further investigation is

Meanwhile, a teenager was attacked with a knife for allegedly objecting to a man spitting on her in Khurja region of Bulandshahr. The incident occurred when the girl was on her way to college, the police said on Friday.

A senior police officer said: "The girl, Sakshi, who was heading to polytechnic, com-plained that the 25-year-old accused, Sonu, spit on her and after she objected to it, he stabbed her with a knife on her

"We have arrested the accused and registered a case against him under Section 307 (attempt to murder) of the Indian Penal Code," the police officer said.

Khurja Circle Officer Dilip Singh said the girl was rushed to a nearby hospital, where she underwent treatment and was later discharged.

The winning innovations catered to diverse areas of research in Healthcare and Clean Energy domains. Winner Akinchan Kushwaha developed 'VivaFeet', a smart healthcare assistant in the

form of a wearable sock that was targeted toward foot-related complications. It provided real-time monitoring of temperature, pressure and GAIT of the foot to help prevent podiatric ailments like foot ulceration and varicose veins at an early stage. It can effectively reduce recovery time and reduce the pain experienced with the help of Electrical Muscle Stimulation of the affected region.

The first runner-up, Dr Abhinav Gupta is developing POC-CET-Lab (Point-Of-Care Cartridgebased Emergency Testing Lab), which is a handheld blood analyser that uses microfluidic-based cartridges for different tests required in emergency care. It consists of a handheld analyser and test-specific microfluidic cartridges. Using a single handheld device and test-specific cartridges, multiple lab tests can be performed in any setting and at a minimal cost.

The second runner-up, Priyaranjan Tiwari's team had devel-

oped NODex devices, which is capable of taking a rapid test for asthma with a non-invasive method that is convenient for children and adults. The individual taking the test has to blow into a handhel that will track the results. It is equipped to identify the type of asthma, track the airway inflammation over time and indicate to the doctor if the individual had been taking the medicines correctly.

Prof Ankush Sharma, Professor-in-charge, Innovation & Incubation, IIT Kanpur, congratulated the winners and said, "Health and Clean energy are two critical domains which require urgent technology interventions in India. The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology's initiative to support novel indigenous technology solutions in these spaces through Hackathon is a praiseworthy effort. I extend my best wishes to the winners on innovating visionary technologies contributing to

India's self-sustainable status.

# **Nothing surprising**

Delhi has decided to take on Islamabad over the latter's disregard for the Indus Waters Treaty

ndia has done the right thing by issuing a notice to Pakistan for modification of the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT). The September 1960 treaty, which came into being after nine years of negotiations between the two countries, is generally seen as one of the most successful water-sharing pacts in the world, with the World Bank also being a signatory. The notice has been necessitated by Islamabad's "intransigence" on the implementation of the IWT. For the last five years, India has been trying to discuss and resolve the issue of India's Kishenganga and Ratle Hydro Electric Projects, but Pakistan has been stubborn, refusing to sort out the matter. India's position, as reported in the media, has always been clear: it wants implementation of IWT in letter and spirit, but Pakistan has



been dillydallying. In 2015, it sought a neutral expert to examine its technical objections to the two hydel projects. But, a year later, it withdrew unilaterally and proposed adjudication by a Court of Arbitration. India objected to two simultaneous processes, an objection that the World Bank acknowledged in 2016. This is despite the fact that the IWT allows a mechanism to resolve such issues. The treaty gives control over the waters of the three "eastern rivers"—the Beas, Ravi, and Sutlej—to India and over the waters of the three "western rivers"—the Indus, Chenab, and Jhelum to Pakistan. This gives India control over around 20 per cent of the total water carried by the Indus system, while the rest goes to Pakistan. Even over the west-

ern river waters, as per the IWT, India has the right to do limited irrigation and unlimited power generation, navigation, floating of property, fish culture, etc.

At the heart of the problem is Pakistan's deep-rooted hatred for India. Still smarting from the defeat in the 1971 Indo-Pak War and its dismemberment, it is determined to not give any concession to India. Even though it is obligatory for nations to extend the 'most favoured nation' (MFN) status to all members of the World Trade Organization, and India gave Pakistan the MFN status, Pakistan refused to reciprocate the gesture for two decades; and then India withdrew that. The reason: 'most favoured nation' translates as 'sabse pasandida mulk' into Urdu—something Pakistan's deep state and radicalised society would never allow. Even now, when the Pakistani rupee is in a free fall, the forex reserves are depleting fast, and the economy has all but crumbled, its generals and jihad-compliant politicians and public figures are unwilling to improve ties with India. Trade with India would surely help Pakistan, but such is the pigheadedness of the powers that be in Islamabad and Rawalpindi that they don't want to normalise ties with New Delhi. They can support terror groups, risking the wrath of the Financial Action Task Force or FATF, but can't strive to have better ties with India, even though that would be for its own good. Therefore, there is nothing surprising in Pakistan disrespecting the IWT.

# Shadow boxing

Upliftment of the Dalits and OBCs should be the agenda, not creating gulf in the society

Tet another controversy is raging even as the one on 'Pathan' has not fully subsided. This time Swami Prasad Maurva, the OBC leader from Uttar Pradesh has reservations about Tulsidas' Ramcharitmanas which according to him spreads hate and has casteist slurs and so should be banned. Swami Prasad Maurya, who switched over to the Samajwadi Party before the 2022 UP Assembly elections, lost his seat in the UP assembly elections. His daughter though continues to be the BJP MP. His new party, however, has taken exception to his criticism of Ramcharitmanas and distanced itself from the statement. It is not the first time Ramcharitmanas has been criticized for casteist slurs or gender bias. In the past too the Epic has attracted criticism and serious debates have taken place on its content.

However, Maurya's statement does no good to either himself, his community,



his party, or the society at large. Without going into the merit of his statement, one can deduce that it does not help to point figure at a 16 the century writer and ask for a ban on a book that was written some 500 years back. A time span long enough to change the languages, contexts, nuances, and morality. Banning a book or expunging the portions does not make sense, it never has. All it does is to refresh the idea. India has a long list of banned books, plays, and films. Aubrey Menen's 'Rama Retold', was banned in 1955, and EV Ramasamy Periyar's book Ramayana Retold, was banned in 1969. Ideally speaking, a writer must not hurt the sentiments of the people but the downside is if the writers always

write to conform to the prevailing norms, society would never change. Equally pathetic is the reaction of the people who would swear by Ramcharitmanas and would go to any extent to abusing and admonishing him publicly. A person has a right to differ in a civil way, if you do not agree do so in a civilized way not by calling names and demonizing the person. We have enough issues of import to talk about in public life that should get precedence over such shadow boxing matches. If Maurya wants to bring about a real change in the society, he would do well to take up issues of discrimination and mistreatment of Dalits and OBCs on priority rather than rake up issues that would only consolidate the caste lines.

# Resetting India Egypt relations



Inviting President of Egypt as the chief guest at Republic day parade can usher in a new era in Indo Egyptian relations

resident Abdel Fattah el-Sisi of Egypt made an interesting choice as the Chief Guest for the 74th Republic Day Parade, a first-ever from an Arab country. The choice is loaded with geopolitical and strategic suggestions that are rooted in realpolitik and better senses. As mutual people of civilizations and historical engagements, the bilateral relationship has gone through intermittent ups and downs borne of compulsions of internal political posturing and 'bloc' pressures.

Jawaharlal Nehru and Gamal Abdel Nasser along with Tito, Nkrumah, and Sukarno had jointly floated the Non-Aligned Movement towards, "abstention from the use of arrangements of collective defense to serve the particular interests of any of the big powers." In the Indian context, shades of that thought exist in its modern course of 'strategic independence'. However, considerations of co-religiosity had ensured that Egypt stood firmly on the side of Pakistan in the 1965 and 1971 wars, as also, Pakistanis had supplied military wherewithal to the Egyptians in1967 (Six-Day War) and 1973 (Yom Kippur War). As both were also Major Non-NATO allies, they had a 'bloc' gravitation. Field Marshal Sisi (former

General in the Egyptian Army) who had deposed a democratically elected government (Mohamed Morsi of the Muslim Brotherhood), presided over India's celebration of adopting its Constitution that coup-proofed the Indian narrative with civilian control over the military, was irony at its best. Sisi has supposedly 'won' 97% of popular votes cast after 'technicalities' had disallowed almost all opposition (after imprisoning 40,000 from the opposition). Sisi is an authoritarian from the old school of Hosni Mubarak (also Air Chief Marshal of the Egyptian Air Force) governance style, only more strident. Serendipitously. on Indian Republic Day he witnessed the real and the largest democracy in the world, at the

plined, apolitical, and constitutionalist Military. Egypt was the fourth country to participate in India's Republic Day celebrations with its marching contingent. Tellingly three of the four foreign contingents to have ever participated had been from Muslim-dominated countries i.e., UAE, Bangladesh, and Egypt(France was fourth). Interestingly, immediately behind the marching Egyptian contingent were the illustrious 61st Cavalrysowars in baycolored horses, who have had

Amalgamated from the various units of the Imperial Service State Forces of the former Indian Princely States, the DNA of 61st Cavalry harbours lancers from former 'States' of Jodhpur, Mysore, Patiala, etc., who took part in the last and most daringly successful cavalry charges in modern military history, at Haifa on 23rd September 1918. A German-led Ottoman expeditionary force was marching toward Egypt to seize the Suez Canal and was pitted against Egyptian Expeditionary Force and the township of Haifa was critical to defeating the Ottoman forces. 15th (Imperial Service) Cavalry Brigade composed of 'State' regiments from Princely 'States' of Jodhpur, Mysore, and Hyderabad was invoked for the near-impossible task against Ottoman forces with machine guns, etc..

Abdel Sisi signed agreements with India to strengthen defence cooperation" and "increase the exchange of counter-terrorism information and intelligence". For a nation that supported Pakistan in its wars with India, Cairo now explores procuring India's Tejas Light Combat Aircraft, Akash missile system, and DRDO's Smart Anti-Airfield Weapon (SAAW). This is a significant shift considering a bulk of Egyptian military hardware is also from China e.g., bombers, fighters, missile system, ships, submarines, drones, etc., Whereas India's nemesis across the Line-of-Control (LOC) still harps on the rote and tiring record of coreligiosity, which is sounding trite and troublesome, even with Arab Sheikhdoms and for autocrats like Abdel Sisi who seek to protect themselves against religious puritanism e.g., Muslim Brotherhood in Egypt. # **EXPECTATIONS OF HEALTHCARE SECTOR**

Budget should rationalise import duty for the healthcare sector

The upcoming Budget is expected to create an enabling healthcare ecosystem with higher allocations and reforms pertaining to longterm credit facilities, a big push for public private partnership (PPP), and tax incentives and relief. High import duty on medical equipment is a major pain point for the hospital sector.

In the upcoming budget, hospitals seek relaxation on imported medical equipment, as they intend to procure state-of-the-art latest technology to treat patients and get the best medical outcome.

Over the years, the import of medical equipment has significantly increased. In 2021-22 imports went up by 41 per cent. As per the industry estimates, India imported medical equipment worth Rs 63,200 crore in 2021-22 compared to Rs 44, 708 crore in 2020-21. On the other hand, Indian equipment manufacturers seek a complete ban on the import of medical equipment or higher custom or import duty and other charges if not a complete ban. The industry has witnessed over 20 per cent hike in the cost of medical equipment import in the last two years.

It would take some more time for large hospitals to work on Indigenous medical equipment. Once Indian manufacturers match the global standards in terms of supply, range, and quality, big hospitals would be in a position to partner with them. Until that time, the government should restrict itself in making imports expensive with heavy duties



The industry is always keen to be aligned with the 'Make in India' initiative or promote indigenous manufacturers. But, for big hospitals, it is more critical to maintain their global competitiveness. Hence, the sector would be expecting a reduction in import duties on medical equipment. Patients would be the ultimate winner. Currently, with heavy import duties on medical equipment, big hospitals' costs of operations significantly increased and they tend to pass on the burden to patients. So, heavy import duties on medical equipment come as a penalty for patients and must be rationalized.

Yet another pain point of the hospitals is pricing and delay in payments from Government schemes like CGHS and others. The segment would be expecting clear guidelines from the government.

The hospital segment expects a robust credit mechanism to overcome the shortage of funds. Long-term (15-20 years) credit facilities would significantly reduce the burden. Interest rate, tenure, and collateral are the major concerns.

The Government needs to impress upon the RBI to look at this pain point seriously for the sake of the financial health of the healthcare sector. The Goods and Services Tax (GST) on inputs increases the delivery cost by 18 per cent. And the providers do not get any input credit facility. Tax incentives for both existing and new healthcare projects are required. For new or green field projects a tax holiday period of 10 years, as given to Special Economic Zones and Tech Parks, would go a long way to transform the sector. It is strongly recommended that the government should create similar zones for hospitals and extend all the benefits including tax incentives.

This should not be limited to the hospital segment. Service providers, who are associated with hospitals, should also be included in such pro-

motional schemes. Overall, it is the right time to introduce some radical structural changes combined with the rationalization of taxes. The sector would keep its

fingers crossed to see the government's measures and policy reforms.

So far, the government has shown its willingness to address the challenges of the sector and hopefully, this time Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman would walk some extra mile with regard to further strengthening the Indian Healthcare sector

# Tech can expedite justice system

# Test of success of Bharat Jodo Yatra lies in polls

Journey to power in New Delhi may not be easy for the Opposition against a formidable, well-oiled machine of BJP

ongress leader Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo ✓Yatra traversing so far through 10 states, reaching almost the last lap, has stirred the party back to the near centre-stage of Indian politics, with a spontaneous crowd responding to it.

The Yatra has evoked interest among the people with the possibility of the rise of a counter-saffron narrative, its avowed aim. It has given acceptance to Rahul Gandhi as a leader even by the BJP. Their top functionaries now accept he has arrived. But will the emerging Third Front at Khammam at Telangana chief minister KC Rao's rally dampen its effort?

Is the yatra a success? To an extent, it can draw many eminent persons from the society

—the youth and children. His 'T' shirt is a great draw and connects. It also shows that Congress can meticulously plan a 3500 kms march from Kanyakumari to Jammu and Kashmir, traversing through 12 states. In every state eminent social persons have been part of it despite severe derisive criticism from a curious or awed BJP and its parivar.

Some of the names include former RBI governor Raghuram Rajan, Mahatma Gandhi's grandson Tushar Gandhi, Šhiv Sena leader Aditya Thackeray, NCP's Surpriya Sule, National Conference leader Farooq Abdullah, lawyer Prashant Bhushan, activist Harsh Mander, Bollywood actors, former RAW secretary and intelligence bureau ex-chief AS Dulat, actors Amol Palekar, Riya Sen, Sandhya Gokhale to Swara Bhaskar, singer Sunidhi Chauhan, IIT professors, former defence, police and other officials.

It was touted that though it might succeed in Kerala, Karnataka, Telangana, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, the Yatra might not succeed in the limited areas of Delhi and UP. It surprisingly succeeded in the kisan belt of western UP, Haryana and Delhi the swelling crowds put the city out of gear.
Still the yatra is not

beyond it. The best quote has come from Congress MP Shashi Tharoor. He said at a book launch in Kolkata that the Yatra has evoked a massive response. However, has noted: "Translating that into

votes is the next challenge and does not follow automatically". That's the problem.

Rahul Gandhi may have sent a message of love but he has also been seen as "loveable" to the BJP as well. His barbs are soft and he has not yet been critical of the BJP's policies: economic, education, privatisation or simple seizure of 10-year-new cars, tractors or high tolls that make miseries deeper and inflation sharper or even for ballot paper voting.

How many of the nine

states going to polls from February can win? Even in Tripura it has entered into an alliance with the CPI-M. Its presence is weak in Meghalaya, Nagaland or Mizoram. The battle will be

Chhattisgarh, MP and Rajasthan. It cannot go alone in Maharashtra, Bihar; it does not have an ally in West Bengal, Odisha. In most states, it has fledgling organisations,

not a match against the BJP. Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge has done well to invite 21 like-minded parties to join the concluding Srinagar ceremony on January 30, Mahatma Gandhi martyr's day. That's where he left the chinks too by not inviting AAP, JD-S, BRS, BJD and Akali Dal.

The latest January 18 Khammam mega rally by Telangana chief Minister and BRS leader K C Rao brings out this weakness and finds presence of a number of them for the launch of a third front tough in Karnataka, and himself as a possible PM.

Rao said, "The Congress and the BJP only indulge in verbal fights". It was attended by Samajwadi leader Akhilesh Yadav, Punjab CM Bhagwant Mann, Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal, Kerala CM Pinarayi Vijayan and CPI general secretary D Raja. How is it to be interpreted? Is it a rally for bargaining seat-sharing with the Congress or splintering its effort? How can the Left ally with Congress in one state and

also form the Third Front? Politics is becoming interesting and intriguing. It is being interpreted as a setback to Bihar chief minister Nitish Kumar's effort to unite the opposition. There is apprehension that if KCR move succeeds it might dampen what the Congress is trying to achieve against the BJP.

Trinamool Congress leader Mamata Banerjee has yet to open her cards.

Most of these parties have splintered away from the Congress whether KCR's BRS or West Bengal's TMC or Andhra's YSR Congress. Even SP and RJD are wary of the rise of the Congress. They fear the minority Muslim votes shifting to the Congress.

The success of the yatra apart, the journey to power in New Delhi may not be easy for the Opposition against a formidable, well-oiled machine of BJP. The Khammam rally may be a new beginning of intense fisticuffs among the opposition ranks. Would it again be advantage BJP or Congress still has something up its sleeves to outshine the run up to 2024? The nation awaits the answer.

# **Go First fined ₹10 lakh** for leaving 55 stranded

Action taken for leaving 55 flyers at Bengaluru Airport on January 9

After Air India, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has imposed a fine of ₹10 lakh on Go First airline for leaving behind 55 passengers at the Bengaluru airport on January 9. A day after the incident, the DGCA had issued a notice to the airline over the incident.

The passengers, who were to board flight G8 116 to Delhi, were left behind on the passenger coach. The airline apologised for the incident, which it said was "caused due to an inadvertent oversight".

"Perusal of reply of M/s Go First reveals that there was improper communication, coordination between terminal coordinator (TC), commercial staff and crew regarding boarding of passengers in the aircraft.

The airline failed to ensure adequate arrangement for ground handling, preparation of load and trim sheet, flight dispatch and passenger/cargo handling and therefore, nator, commercial staff, and enforcement action in the form crew regarding boarding of



of Financial Penalty of ₹10, 00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakh only) has been imposed for violation of CAR Section 3, Series C, Part II and of Air Transport Circular 02 of 2019," the DGCA said in an order.

It further stated: "It is pertinent to mention that DGCA has issued Civil Aviation Requirements (CAR) Section -Series-C, Part-II on Minimum Requirements for Grant of Air Operator Certificate to Operate Scheduled Air Transport Services (Passenger)." and Air Transport Circular 02 of 2019 on 'Facilities/Courtesies to esteemed travelling public at airports.

The aviation regulator had said "multiple mistakes" could be easily avoided. The DGCA had sent notice to the airline for "multiple mistakes" soon after the incident and demanded an explanation. Go First's response revealed that there was improper communication, coordination between terminal coordi-

passengers in the aircraft, the DGCA said, adding that the airline failed to ensure adequate arrangement for ground handling, preparation of load and trim sheet, flight dispatch, and passenger/cargo handling. Flight G8 116 took off for

Delhi from Bengaluru's Kempegowda International Airport around 6.30 am on January 9 this year, as 55 passengers, who had their boarding passes, and bags checkedin, were left behind in one of the four buses that took pasngers to the aircraft.

The passengers were reportedly accommodated on a flight that left four hours later, at around 10 am. A day after the incident, Go First, on January 10, apologised for the inconvenience caused to the passengers due to an inadvertent oversight in the reconciliation of the flight. It also said that affected passengers will be offered one free ticket for travel on any domestic sector in the next 12 months.

The airline has initiated an inquiry into the incident and the matter is being investigated. All concerned staff (are) off the roaster till the inquiry is going on," it had said. On January 24, DGCA imposed a fine of ₹10 lakh on Air India for not reporting two incidents of unruly passenger behaviour onboard a Paris-New Delhi flight on December 6, 2022.

# 'Antibiotics in India, China wastewater pose health threat'

Antibiotic residues in waste-water and wastewater treatment plants in India and China—both major producers and consumers of antibiotics-— may serve as hot spots for the development of antibiotic resistance in these regions, posing a potential threat to human health through exposure to different sources of water, including drinking water.

These observations of the researchers from Karolinska Institute were published in The Lancet Planetary Health. The researchers also determined the relative contribution of various sources of antibiotic contamination in waterways, such as hospitals, municipalities, livestock, and pharma-



ceutical manufacturing. Bacteria that become resistant to antibiotics are a global threat that can lead to untreatable bacterial infections in animals and humans.

"Our results can help decision-makers to target risk reduction measures against environmental residues of priority antibiotics and in highrisk sites, to protect human health and the environment,"

says Nada Hanna, researcher at tal hazard assessment", the the Department of Global Public Health at Karolinska Institutet in Sweden, and the study's first author.

"Allocating these resources efficiently is especially vital for resource-poor countries that produce large amounts of antibiotics." Antibiotics can enter the environment during their production, consumption and disposal. Antibiotic residues in the environment, such as in wastewater and drinking water, can contribute to the emergence and spread of resistance.

As per the publication, "Antibiotic concentrations and antibiotic resistance in aquatic environments of the Western Pacific and South-East Asia Regions: a systematic review and probabilistic environmen-

researchers examined the levels of antibiotic residues that are likely to contribute to antibiotic resistance from different aquatic sources in the Western Pacific Region (WPR) and the South-East Asia Region (SEAR), regions as defined by World Organization. These regions include China and India, which are among the world's largest producers and consumers of

This was done by a systematic review of the literature published between 2006 and 2019, including 218 relevant reports from the WPR and 22 from the SEAR. The researchers also used a method Probabilistic called Environmental Hazard Assessment to determine where the concentration of antibiotics is high enough to likely contribute to antibiotic resistance.

Ninety-two antibiotics were detected in the WPR, and forty five in the SEAR. Antibiotic concentrations exceeding the level considered safe for resistance development (Predicted No Effect Concentrations, PNECs) were observed in wastewater, influents and effluents of wastewater treatment plants and in receiving aquatic environments.

The highest risk was observed in wastewater and the influence of wastewater treatment plants. The relative impact of various contributors. such as hospital, municipal, livestock, and pharmaceutical manufacturing was also deter-

m he\, Enforcement\, Directorate\, (ED)}$  has attached 32 immovable and movable properties in Maharashtra and Karnataka worth over Rs 69,65 crore under the Prevention of Money Laundering (PMLA) in a case relating to fraudulent issuance of TDS refund of Rs 263 crore from Income Tax Department by Tanaji Mandal Adhikari, Senior Tax Assistant and oth-

These attached assets include land, flats, luxury cars which are held in the name of Bhushan Anant Patil, Rajesh Shetty, Sarika Shetty, Kriti Verma and others. Earlier, the agency had issued freezing orders under PMLA in respect of 33 bank accounts of various entities having balances of Rs 96.23 crore and seized cash of Rs 2.85 lakh.

The ED has initiated investigations under the PMLA based upon an FIR registered by CBI on the basis of written complaint of Additional Director General (Vigilance)-4 CBDT about bogus issuance of refunds for assessment Years 2007-08 and 2008-09.

Tanaji Mandal Adhikari, while working as a Senior Tax Assistant, had access to RSA Tokens and login credentials of his supervisory authorities and he had



allegedly orchestrated the fraud in connivance with others in fraudulently generating TDS refunds exceeding Rs 263 crore and transferred in various bank accounts including the bank account of SB Enterprises (a proprietary concern of Bhushan Anant Patil).

CBI has filed charge sheet against Tanaji Mandal Adhikari, Bhushan Anant Patil, Rajesh Shantaram Shetty and others for committing offences under the Indian Penal Code (IPC), Prevention of Corruption

Act and Section 66 of Information Technology Act, the ED said in a statement. Investigation under PMLA revealed that, during the period from November 15, 2019 to November 4, 2020, as many as 12 fraudulent TDS refunds were generated by Tanaji Mandal Adhikari amounting Rs. 263,95,31,870 which were fraudulently credited in the account of SB Enterprises,

These Proceeds of Crime (PoC) were subsequently transferred into the bank accounts of Bhushan Anant Patil and other related persons and entities and also in shell companies.

PMLA probe revealed that immovable properties in the form of lands at Lonavala, Khandala, Karjat, Pune and Udupi areas, flats at Panvel and Mumbai areas and movable assets in the form three luxury cars (BMW X7, Mercedes GLS400d, Audi O7) have been acquired out of the proceeds of crime in their names and in the names of other related persons. On identification of these assets, a Provisional Attachment Order under PMLA was issued attaching 32 assets

worth Rs 69,65,99,720, it said. Out of total Proceeds of Crime of Rs 263 crore, assets of Rs 166 crore have been seized attached provisionally, it added.

# Jerusalem, West Bank on edge after outbreak of violence

Tsrael's Defence Minister signalled on Friday that the military would stop its airstrikes if Palestinian militant groups halted rocket attacks, a day after the deadliest Israeli raid in decades raised the prospect of

a major flare-up in fighting.

After the exchange of Palestinian rockets and Israeli airstrikes on Gaza overnight, residents of Jerusalem were on edge Friday morning as they waited to see what comes next.

Israel's defense minister instructed the military to prepare for new strikes in the Gaza Strip "if necessary."

The bombardments followed an Israeli raid in the flashpoint Jenin refugee camp, which turned into a gun battle that killed at least seven militants and a woman and sparked clashes elsewhere.

Of the five rockets fired at Israel, three were intercepted, one fell in an open area and another fell short inside Gaza, the military said.

The escalation in the decades-long Israeli-Palestinian conflict created an early test for Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's new far-right government, which came to office

Palestinians soared and has vowed to take a hard line.

The raid also prompted the Palestinian Authority to halt security coordination with Israel and drew "deep concern" from the State Department just days before US Secretary of

State Antony Blinken was expected to visit the region.


So far, the hostilities have followed a familiar pattern that allows both sides to respond without forcing the other side into a major escalation. Palestinian militants fired rockets from Gaza toward the south of Israel.

Israel retaliated with nonlethal airstrikes on militant targets in Gaza, such as training camps and an underground

rocket manufacturing site. Israeli Defense Minister Yoav Gallant claimed the military dealt a "tough blow" to Palestinian militants in Gaza and said the army was preparing to strike "high-quality targets ... Until peace is restored to the citizens of Israel."

Farm where 4 were killed had another shooting last summer

The shooting that left four dead at a California mushroom farm on Monday was at least the second time an employee tried to kill a coworker on the property, records show.

Martin Medina, a manager at California Terra Garden, was charged with attempted murder after he threatened to kill another manager and then fired a shot into the man's trail-

The bullet went through the trailer and into a neighbouring one that was home to Yetao Bing, one of the workers killed on Monday, a prosecutor told The Associated Press. No one was injured.

Law enforcement interviewed Bing's wife, Ping Yang, but it's not clear from those interviews whether Bing was at

home during the shooting, said Sean Gallagher, chief deputy district attorney for San Mateo County.

Medina remains in custody on USD 5 million bail and appeared in court Monday for preliminary hearing, hours before authorities say Chunli Zhao shot and killed four coworkers and wounded a fifth at California Terra Garden. Prosecutors say Zhao then drove to a nearby farm where he used to work and killed three more people.

The Bay Area News Group first reported last summer's shooting.

Zhao, 66, told KNTV-TV in a courthouse interview Thursday that he committed the fatal shootings. Zhao said he was bullied and worked long hours on the farms and that his complaints were ignored, the station reported.

Indian-American astronaut nominated by Biden for appointment to grade of an Air Force Brigadier General

ndian-American astronaut Raja J Chari has been nominated by President Joe Biden for the appointment to the grade of Air Force brigadier general.

The nomination was announced on Thursday and will have to be confirmed by the Senate which approves all senior civilian and military appointments, according to the US Defence Department.

Air Force Colonel Chari, 45, was nominated for the appointment to the grade of brigadier general, it said in a statement.

Chari is currently serving as the Crew-3 commander and astronaut, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Johnson Space Center, Texas.

He earned a master's

degree in aeronautics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and graduated from the US Naval Test Pilot School in Patuxent River, Maryland.

Chari served as the commander of the 461st Flight Test Squadron and the director of the F-35 Integrated Test Force at Edwards Air Force Base in California.

Inspired by his father Srinivas Chari, who went to the US at a young age from Hyderabad for an engineering degree, to get a higher education and make a successful career. He met his wife and spent his entire career at John Deere in Waterloo.

In 2020, Chari was selected as the Commander of the SpaceX Crew-3 mission to the International Space Station (ISS) by NASA and the European Space Agency.

# Ukraine Pres' office: 10 killed in latest Russian shelling

ussian shelling killed at least 10Ukrainian civilians and wounded 20 others in a day, the office of Ukraine's president reported Friday as the country worked to recover from an earlier wave of Russian missile strikes and drone

The new casualties included the deaths of at least two civilians in the southern city of Kherson, which Ukrainian troops recaptured in November, and two more in eastern Ukraine's Donetsk province. The missiles and self-propelled drones Russian forces fired Thursday hit

deeper into Ukrainian territory, killing at least 11 people.

The bombardment followed announcements by the United States and Germany of plans to ship powerful tanks to help Ukraine defend itself. Other Western countries said they also would share modern tanks from their stockpiles.

Moscow has bristled at the move, and accused Western nations of entering a new level of confrontation

Gov Pavlo Kyrylenko of the eastern Donetsk region said the Russian military used phosphorus munitions in shelling the village of Zvanivka. The village is located about 20 kilo-

meters north of Bakhmut, a city that has become the focus of a gruelling battle in recent months. The shelling also damaged apartment buildings and two schools in the nearby town of Vuhledar, Kyrylenko said.

The governor of the neighbouring Luhansk region, Serhii Haidai, said Ukrainian shelling hit two Russian bases in the occupied towns of Kreminna and Rubizhne, killing and wounding "dozens" of Russian soldiers. His claim couldn't be independently verified.

Further south, Russian troops resumed shelling the town of Nikopol, across the Dnieper from the Russia-held Zaporizhzhia Nuclear



Power Plant, damaging apartment buildings, gas pipelines, power lines

and a bakery, officials said. Separately Friday, Russian

authorities took new steps in their months-long and widely criticised effort to graft four Ukrainian provinces onto Russia's already vast territory. They said the illegally annexed provinces would switch from the time zone that covers Kyiv to the one in Moscow.

The Ukrainian southern and eastern regions that Russia declared as part of its territory four months ago

Donetsk, Luhansk, Zaporizhzhia and Kherson — will take place "in the near future," Russia's Ministry of Industry and Trade said. The move comes as part of what the ministry called the "gradual synchronization" of Russian legislation after the "admis-

sion of the four subjects." Russian President Vladimir Putin's highly orchestrated announcement of the illegal annexations came despite widespread international condemnation and the fact that Russia didn't fully control the areas it annexed. Russia claims to control nearly all of Luhansk and about half of Donetsk.

Less than 1-1/2 months after the annexations, Russia lost control of the city of Kherson and broad swaths of the surrounding territory under the brunt of a Ukrainian counteroffensive. Kherson was the only regional capital Russia seized since starting its invasion on Feb.

Bank of Baroda tumbled 7.36 per cent, State Bank of India tanked 5.03 per cent, Bank of India declined 5.63 per cent, Punjab National Bank fell 5.31 per cent and Central Bank of India dipped 4.03 per cent on the BSE. Shares of LIC fell 3.45 per cent.

The Adani Group on Thursday said it is examining legal options to take "punitive action" against Hindenburg Research for its "reckless" attempt to sabotage a mega share sale at the conglomerate's flagship firm -- a statement that the US activist investor responded by saying it stands by its report that alleged "brazen" market manipulation and accounting fraud by the group.

"The maliciously mischievous, unresearched report published by Hindenburg Research on January 24, 2023, has adversely affected the Adani Group, our shareholders and investors. The volatility in Indian stock markets created by the report is of great concern and has led to unwanted anguish for Indian citizens," Adani Group's lead head Jatin Jalundhwala said in a statement.

#### MODIFY INDUS WATER PACT, INDIA TELLS PAK

"The initiation of two simultaneous processes on the same questions and the potential of their inconsistent or contradictory outcomes create an unprecedented and legally untenable situation, which risks endangering IWT itself. The World Bank acknowledged this itself in 2016, and took a decision to "pause" the initiation of two parallel processes and requested India and Pakistan to seek an amicable way out," sources said.

They said despite repeated efforts by India to find a mutually agreeable way forward, Pakistan refused to discuss the issue during the five meetings of the Permanent Indus Commission from 2017 to 2022. At Pakistan's continuing insistence, the World Bank has recently initiated actions on both the neutral expert and Court of Arbitration processes, they said.

India and Pakistan signed the treaty in 1960 after nine years of negotiations, with the World Bank being a signatory of the pact. The treaty sets out a mechanism for cooperation and information exchange between the two countries regarding the use of waters of several rivers.

It gives control over the waters of the three "eastern rivers" -- the Beas, Ravi, and Sutlej -- to India and control over the waters of the three "western rivers" -- the Indus, Chenab, and Jhelum -- to Pakistan. India has about 20 per cent of the total water carried by the Indus system, while Pakistan has 80 per cent.

The treaty allows India to put the western river waters to limited irrigation use and unlimited non-consumptive use for such applications as power generation, navigation, floating of property, fish culture, etc. It lays down detailed regulations for India in building projects over the western rivers. The IWT is considered one of the most successful water-sharing endeavours in the world today.

The notice will open up the process for making changes to

the treaty for the first time since it was signed in Karachi on September 19, 1960, by then Pakistan president Mohammad Ayub Khan, then Indian Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru and WAB Ill of the World Bank.

The notice was issued in line with Article XII (3) of the treaty, "The provisions of this Treaty may time be modified by a duly ratified treaty concluded for that purpose between the two Governments."

While explaining India's move, the people noted that in 2015, Pakistan requested the World Bank to appoint a "neutral expert" to examine its technical objections to India's Kishenganga and Ratle hydropower projects. In 2016, Pakistan unilaterally retracted this request and proposed a "court of arbitration" should adjudicate on the objections. This unilateral action by Pakistan contravened the "graded mechanism of dispute settlement" envisaged by Article IX of the Indus Waters Treaty, the Indian side contended. India then made a separate request to the World Bank for the matter to be referred to a neutral expert.

At the time of independence in 1947, the boundary between India and Pakistan was drawn across the Indus Basin, leaving Pakistan as the lower riparian state. A dispute arose because some important irrigation works, including one at Madhopur on Ravi river and another at Ferozepur on Sutlej river, on which the irrigation canal supplies in Pakistan's Punjab province were completely dependent, were left in Indian territory.

The treaty includes a mechanism for cooperation and information exchange regarding their use of rivers, known as the Permanent Indus Commission, which has a commissioner from each country. According to the World Bank, the pact also has distinct procedures to handle issues - "questions" are handled by the commission, "differences" are resolved by a neutral expert, and "disputes" are referred to the court of arbitration, a sevenmember arbitral tribunal.

The World Bank's role is "limited and procedural". Its role in "differences" and "disputes" is limited to designating individuals to fulfill roles as a neutral expert or in the court of arbitration proceedings when requested by either or both sides.

#### RAHUL'S YATRA HALTS IN J&K, CONG SLAMS SECURITY BREACH

As both the leaders were walking along with several others, some of the overenthusiastic residents breached the outer security cordon and tried to come close and meet Rahul after which the yatra was suspended. In the absence of an outer security cordon and adequate security personnel, Rahul was advised by his security staff to avoid marching further.

Initially, Rahul was keen to continue the march, but his security officers escorted him to safety in a four wheeler to prevent any mishap. Later, Rahul arrived at the Dak Bungalow, Khanabal in South Kashmir district of Anantnag and made a brief statement. He told reporters, "I had to cancel my walk for the day because police arrangements unfortunately completely collapsed."

"Police personnel who were supposed to manage the crowd were nowhere to be seen," the former Congress president told reporters during the special briefing.

"It's the Jammu and Kashmir administration's responsibility to provide security... I hope security will now be ensured for the remaining days of the yatra," Rahul, who started his Bharat Jodo Yatra in Kanyakumari in September with a plan to end it in Srinagar on January 30, said.

"I had to call off my walk because I can't go against my security people," the Congress leader said.

Former J&K Chief Minister Omar Abdullah in a separate tweet corroborated the Congress' version. "I'm witness to this. The outer ring of the cordon which was maintained by J&K Police simply vanished within minutes of Rahul Gandhi starting to walk. We had just crossed into Kashmir from Jammu and were looking forward to the 11 KM walk but unfortunately it had to be cancelled," he tweeted.

Senior Congress leader Jairam Ramesh added that Rahul's security team is holding discussions with the J&K administration to ensure that everything goes off smoothly for the next few days. As the Congress party leaders launched a massive campaign the social media handle of the J&K Police, Kashmir zone posted a series of tweets claiming, "JKP was not consulted before taking any decision on discontinuation of Yatra after conducting a 1 km yatra by organisers. Rest of the yatra continued peacefully. There was no security lapse at all. We will provide fool-proof security". The police said, "Only authorised persons as identified by organisers & frisked crowd were allowed inside towards the route of Yatra. Organisers & managers of BJY did not intimate about the large gathering from Banihal joining the Yatra, which thronged the starting point".

Referring to the security arrangement, J&K Police tweeted, 'Full security arrangements were in place including 15 Coys of CAPFs and 10 Coys of JKP, comprising of ROPs and QRTs, route domination, lateral deployment and SFs were deployed for highridge and other deployments". The Government is acutely mindful of the security concerns and all arrangements have been made to ensure the best possible security for the ongoing Bharat Jodo yatra: RK Goyal, Addl Chief Secy (FC), Home Dept J&K, said on Rahul's security breach.

# Surya will bring about global revolution in T20 cricket: Ponting

T egendary Australian crick-Leter Ricky Ponting has called India middle-order batter Suryakumar Yadav a trailblazer, who could inspire a new breed of players to emulate his style of play and take T20 cricket to "another level" globally.

Suryakumar, 32, was recently named the ICC Men's T20I Cricketer of the Year after he became only the second batter in the world to score 1000-plus runs in a calendar year in the shortest format of the game.

Surya scored two centuries and nine half-tons on way to amassing 1,164 runs in 2022, only second behind Pakistan's Mohammad Rizwan who leads the charts with 1,326 runs in 2021.

"I think innovation-wise, skill-wise, I haven't seen a better player (than Suryakumar) in the game," Ponting told ICC on Friday.

he's doing and it's going to add another level of skill to the T20 game all around the world. "Someone said during the IPL this year (2022), there are going to be guys who are going to try and do exactly the same as what Surya's doing, and that's going to be great for the game," added the

Australian great. Surya's 1,100-plus runs last year came in 31 T20Is at an astonishing strike rate of 187.43 and an average of 46.56, which also propelled him to the top of the ICC Men's T20I Batting Rankings.

Ponting also called the India cricketer as the greatest innovator in the shortest version, comparing his style of batting with South African white-ball specialist AB de Villiers and former Australian wicket-keeper Adam Gilchrist.

"He's probably doing it (242).

better than anyone's ever done it right now. We talk about players that can score 360 degrees ... some of the shots he's hitting back behind the wicket-keeper and over fine leg are just remarkable.'

Ponting said he noticed Surya's innate talent a few years back in the IPL where he was making flicking the ball over deep-backward square look so easy.

The former skipper added that the batter has

# NOVAK IS GOING FOR 10

Djoker's perfect record in Melbourne Park semifinals continues on Friday as he booked a 10th tilt at Australian Open glory

rampant Novak Djokovic Surged into a 10th Australian Open final on Friday to close in on a record-equalling 22nd Grand Slam crown, with only Stefanos Tsit-sipas now standing in his way.

The Serbian fourth seed overcame an early wobble to romp past unseeded American Tommy Paul 7-5, 6-1, 6-2 on Rod Laver Arena in style.

Another title on Sunday will move him alongside Rafael Nadal with 22 Slam wins and see the 35-year-old return to world number one for the first time since last June.

Djokovic played the clash without father Srdjan courtside after he was filmed posing with a man holding a Russian flag featuring Vladimir Putin's face following his son's quarter-final win on Wednesday.

The incident sparked a backlash from Ukraine and led to calls for Djokovic's father to be banned from the tournament.

Srdjan issued a statement ahead of the semi-final saying he would stay away, insisting he "wishes only for peace" and never wanted to cause "disrup-

There was an empty seat next to his mother Dijana during the match.

"I'm really thankful that I have enough gas in my legs to be able to play at this level on one of the biggest tennis courts in the world," said Djokovic, who is now 11-0 for the season and into a 33rd Grand Slam final.

After that wobble, it was all business, despite clutching his strapped hamstring several next two sets with minimal resistence.

He will meet Tsitsipas next after the Greek battled into his first Australian final and only second at a Grand Slam.

In the previous one, at Roland Garros in 2021, he fell to Djokovic in five sets after hold-



# Tsitsipas in dreamland after reaching maiden Australian Open final

 $S_{\mathrm{was}}$  living the dream after reaching the Australian Open final on Friday for a first time and standing on the cusp of becoming world number one.

The Greek third seed showed grit to defeat Russia's Karen Khachanov and set up a final against either nine-time Melbourne champion Novak Djokovic.

The 18th-seeded Khachanov threatened a comeback after saving two match points to force the semi-final into a fourth set, before Tsitsipas tri-umphed 7-6 (7/2), 6-4, 6-7 (6/8), 6-3.

Tsitsipas can top the world rankings if he wins his first Grand Slam crown on Sunday.

"I dreamed as a kid to maybe one day get to play in this court against the best players in the world," Tsitsipas told a sunny Rod Laver Arena after winning an Australian Open semi-final at the fourth

attempt.
"So I'm happy with the fight I put out there today. I feel blessed, blessed that I'm able to play tennis at this level.

"I've been wanting for many years now to put Greek tennis on the map."

At 24, Tsitsipas is the youngest man to reach the Australian Open final since a 23-year-old Djokovic in 2011. Tsitsipas has thrived in

Melbourne throughout his career, after bursting on the scene at the 2019 event as a 20year-old when he dethroned defending champion Roger Federer in the last 16.

He went on to reach the semi-finals that year and again in 2021 and 2022, falling one match short on each occasion.

A Grand Slam crown has remained elusive, with his runner-up showing at Roland Garros in 2021 his best result so far, falling to Djokovic in five sets after holding a 2-0 lead.

# Ukraine could boycott Paris Olympics if Russian athletes take part

Ukraine's sports minister warned on Thursday his country could boycott the 2024 Paris Ólympics if Russian and Belarusian athletes are allowed to take part. The International Olympic Committee (IOC) said lnesdav it was seeking a 'pathway" for Russians to take part in the Games despite the invasion of Ukraine.

Ukraine's sports minister Vadym Goutzeit said such a move was "unacceptable".

"Our position remains unchanged — as long as the war continues in Ukraine, Russian and Belarusian athletes should not be in international competitions," Goutzeit wrote on Facebook.

"If we are not heard, I do not exclude the possibility that we will boycott and refuse to participate in the Olympics.

Russia and its ally Belarus have been sidelined from most Olympic sports since Russian forces invaded Ukraine last February.

Ignoring calls from Ukraine to ban Russian and Belarusian athletes from next year's summer Olympics, the ÍOC said on Wednesday that a way to allow competitors from those countries to take part as neutrals should be "further explored". The IOC said "no athlete should be prevented from com-

peting just because of their passport". Following that announcement, the Olympic Council of Asia on Thursday offered athletes from both countries the Asian Games. That is a signifi-

petition in Asia to allow them to compete in Paris. The IOC's stance was strongly criticised by Britain and Denmark on Thursday.

Britain, which has supplied military and humanitarian support to Ukraine since the invasion began, said the IOC's move was a "world away from the reality of war".

Britain's Culture Secretary Michelle Donelan said: "We condemn any action that allows President Putin to legitimise his illegal war in Ukraine.

"This position from the IOC is a world away from the reality of war being felt by the Ukrainian people — and IOC president (Thomas) Bach's own words less than a year ago where he strongly condemned Russia for breaking the Olympic Truce and urged it to 'give peace a chance'," she added.



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
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




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
