# Where're 80K cops, HC slams Punjab for Amritpal's escape

The Punjab & Haryana High Court on Tuesday slammed the Punjab Government over the "intelligence failure" that led to pro-Khalistan preacher giving police the slip. "You have 80,000 cops. What were they doing? How did Amritpal Singh escape?" the High Court asked Punjab Government.

The State Government informed the HC that the stringent National Security Act has been invoked against Amritpal.

Police arrested four people who helped the radical preacher on Saturday carry out his escape as police cars gave chase.

Amritpal switched from one car to another, changed clothes at a gurdwara and then fled along with three other associates on two motorcycles. About 154 people have been arrested since police began its crackdown against those linked with the preacher and "Waris Punjab De".

Three more people, includ ing the preacher's uncle Harjit Singh, were brought Tuesday to the central jail in Assam's Dibrugarh. Four others were sent there on Sunday. The jail now holds seven men caught during the operation that began weeks after Amritpal Singh and his supporters stormed the Ajnala police station near Amritsar on February 23.



## US raps Khalistani vandals; diaspora in UK stands by Indian High Commission

WASHINGTON/LONDON

ssuring security to Indian Adiplomats and their premises in the US Washington has condemned as "absolutely unacceptable" the attack on the Indian Consulate in San Francisco by alleged Khalistan supporters during a

The US State Department issued a statement indicating that those behind the act would be held accountable. "The US condemns the attack on

Sunday against the Indian Consulate in San Francisco. Violence against diplomatic facilities within the US is a punishable crime," it said.

Senior Indian diplomats have told their American counterparts that they anticipate more such protests by antinational and anti-social elements in the coming weeks and months. Security has been increased at all the Indian diplomatic missions in the US.

Taking a serious note of the incident on Sunday, India late on Monday summoned US

Charge d'affaires in New Delh to register a protest. The US was also asked to take appropriate measures to prevent the recurrence of such incidents.

The US official condemnation late on Monday came after the protesters on Sunday broke open the makeshift security barriers raised by the San Francisco police and installed two so-called Khalistan flags on the Indian Consulate premises However, two consulate personnel soon removed these

## Pak skips SCO meet after India objects to flawed J&K map

Pakistan on Tuesday reportedly skipped a meeting under the aegis of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) here after India raised objection to Pakistan map incorrectly depicting borders of

Jammu & Kashmir. The meeting pertained to military medicine specialists under the SCO and when India asked Pakistan to refrain from showing its map, its delegation decided not to attend it.

India had reportedly urged Pakistan not to show the map or not attend the seminar here, it was learnt. India has in the past also raised objections to Pakistan's inaccurate maps in the SCO meetings.

In September, 2020, India walked out of a virtual meeting of national security advisers (NSA) of member-states of the SCO after the Pakistani representative projected a map that inaccurately depicted the borders of the two countries.

"At the meeting of the national security advisers (NSAs) of member-states of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), hosted by the chair of the SCO (Russia), the Pakistani NSA deliberately projected a fictitious map that Pakistan has recently been propagating," said External Affairs Ministry had then said.

'This was in blatant disregard to the advisory by the host against it and in violation of the norms of the meeting. After consultation with the host, the Indian side left the meeting in protest at that juncture," it

#### **UAPA** tribunal upholds ban on PFI, 7 affiliates

The UAPA tribunal on Tuesday upheld the Central Government's decision declaring the Popular Front of India (PFI) and its seven associated organisations as unlawful association and imposing a fiveyear ban on it.

Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma of the Delhi High Court, heading the tribunal, formed under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, pronounced the verdict confirming the ban on the PFI and its related organisations. On Sept 27 last year, the Centre had banned the PFI for five years.

#### Hanging least painless capital sentence? SC wants experts' advice

The Supreme Court on Tuesday suggested the formation of an expert committee to examine whether death by hanging is the most suitable and painless method to implement the death penalty.

The bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justice PS Narasimha also asked Attorney General R Venkataramani to furnish details on whether there is any data or study undertaken regarding the impact and pain caused during death by hanging and whether it is the most

suitable method available today. The judges also said the Supreme Court can form a committee to conduct a study on the matter if the Government has not under-

taken any study on this. "Mr AG, come back to us and we should have better data before us on the impact of death by hanging, pain caused and the period taken for such death to take place, availability of resources to effectuate



such hanging by death. And whether today's science suggesting that this is the best method today or there is another method which is more suitable to uphold human dignity, said the Bench. "If Central Government

has not done this study, then we can form a committee which can have experts from national law universities like NLU Delhi, Bangalore or Hyderabad, some doctors from AIIMS distinguished people across the country and some scientific experts," added the Bench.

The top court was hearing a petition of advocate Rishi Malhotra to do away with death by hanging and to adopt alternative methods like injection or electrocution which he claimed are comparatively

# BJP most important foreign political party in world for US: WSJ

An opinion piece in the influential Wall Street Journal has described the BJP as the most important foreign political party in the world for America's national interests and the "linchpin" of the US strategy in the Indo-Pacific amid China's increasing assertiveness in the region.

The BJP may also be the least understood, the opinion piece written by Walter Russell Mead, a leading American academic, commented. He added that the party combines the most striking principles of three major political entities in the world — the Likud Party of Israel, the Communist Party of China and the Muslim **Continued on Page 2** | Brotherhood of Egypt.

According to the opinion piece published on Monday, the BJP is poorly understood in the West because it grows out of a political and cultural history unfamiliar to most non-

The BJP's electoral dominance reflects the success of a "once obscure and marginal social movement of national renewal based on efforts by generations of social thinkers and activists to chart a distinctively Hindu path to modernisation", it says.

Mead also highlights the importance of stronger ties between the US and India.

### Defence production: 'Makers | Include millet-based diet should focus on desi design' in PM-POSHAN: Panel

Underlining the need for self-reliance in defence production, IAF Chief V R Chaudhari on Tuesday said here manufacturers should also focus on indigenous design and development and not confine themselves only to pro-

Stressing upon this point, he also said called for building offensive and defensive space capabilities to safeguard assets, and developing directed energy weapons that have significant advantages over traditional weapons. Chaudhari also said stakeholder collaboration was imperative to achieve selfreliance, and without it, "we will wallow in the dark.'

Pointing out that future wars will be across the entire spectrum including land, sea, air, cyber and space, the IAF chief said "the key to faster development of niche tech-



nology is to identify core areas of development, clearly articulate requirements, and closely interact with the industry to design and develop the tech-

Addressing the Def Tech 2023 on "India's Aerospace Capabilities And Technology Requirements", the IAF chief said "the weapons of India @100 would look very different from weapons of India @ 75". He went into flashback to demonstrate the capability difference due to technological enhancements over a gap of 25 years, from 1998 to now.

Millets or Shree Anna (coarse grains) can be the best bet for India's fight against malnutrition and thereby tuberculosis (TB) in children, a Parliamentary panel has noted as it suggested a millet-based diet chart should be included in the central flagship PM-POSHAN (Pradhan Mantri Poshan Shakti Nirman) Scheme The Committee headed by

Rajya Sabha MP Bhubaneswar Kalita noted that the twin problems of malnutrition and tuberculosis pose challenges to Health orders in considerable magnitude in certain States in the country. "These two problems tend to interact with each other as nutritional status is significantly lower in patients suffering from tuberculosis. Similarly, malnutrition can lead to immunodeficiency which increases the person's susceptibility to infection. In this light, the Government's push for 'Shree Anna' (coarse grains) or millets as announced in Budget

2023-24 can play a key role in addressing the challenge of malnutrition particularly in children in India," said the panel in its report submitted to Parliament recently. It recommended the ICMR to undertake a research project in coordination with Índian Institute of Millet Research and develop a diet chart constituting different types of Shree Anna including Raagi, Bajra, Jowar, Ramdana, etc.

'The Committee is hopeful that this diet chart, if included in the PM-POSHAN Scheme, can go a long way in improving the nutritional status of children and thereby reducing the TB case load in the country," said the

The panel's observations come in the backdrop of various researches showcasing that these 'smart foods" can boost growth in children and adolescents by 26 39% when they replace rice in standard meals. The results suggested that millets can significantly contribute to overcoming

We may still come to the conclusion that death by hanging is appropriate but we need to be aided by a study, the bench noted.

The plea said the Law Commission in its 187th report had noted that there was a significant increase in the number of countries that abolished hanging and substituted it by electrocution, shooting or lethal injection. "It had categorically opined that hanging is undoubtedly accompanied by intense physical torture and pain," said the petition. Malhotra argued that the process in India of hanging till death is absolutely cruel and inhumane.

"We have to see if this method satisfies the test of proportionality or whether there is another method which can be adopted so that death by hanging can be declared as unconstitutional," the bench observed.

Justice Narasimha said that there should be dignity in death and it should be as painless as possible and hanging seemed to satisfy the same. "Hanging seems to satisfy both these conditions... Does lethal injection satisfy on this count? Union Government also says in lethal injection, death is not immediate," he said.

"Have you looked at anecdotal incidents of lethal injection? If it is a heavy weight patient, the patient struggles to die," CJI Chandrachud weighed

Kejriwal said that isfaction. Kejriwal said that the budget, which will now be presented on Wednesday, had been approved "without any change" and questioned the practice of sending it to the Centre for clearance.

The Delhi Budget was scheduled to be tabled in the assembly on Tuesday, but the AAP government could not do so after the MHA sought clarification on the allocation of funds for infrastructure and advertisements.

While the matter sparked a fresh row between the AAP government and the Centre, the BJP on Tuesday alleged that the Kejriwal dispensation sat on the clarifications sought by the Ministry of Home Affairs for three days and then blamed the Centre for gaining "cheap pub-

But speaking in the Assembly, Kejriwal alleged that the Centre's objection was a departure from tradition and an attack on the Constitution.

"The Delhi government wants to work and not fight. We are tired of fighting and it serves no one. We want to work together with the prime minister, we do not want any tus-



He said the Centre had raised four queries.
"We replied to them with-

out any other change in the budget. Now, they have given approval to it which proves that their ego was satisfied that the Delhi government bowed wn," Kejriwal said.

Taking a dig at the objection of the Centre and LG office that the budget 2023-24 had higher a provision for advertisement and relatively lower for infrastructure, the AAP supremo said that "uneducat-' people were posted from top to bottom.

 $F^{\text{ormer Delhi Deputy Chief}}_{\text{Minister Manish Sisodia on}}$ Tuesday told a Delhi court he has cooperated with the CBI investigation into the excise policy case and none of the searches have revealed any incriminating material against him. Sisodia's counsel, while making submissions on the bail plea of the AAP leader, said his custodial interrogation was no longer required and he was not a flight risk.

"I am public servant but two other public servants, against whom allegations are graver have not been arrested. his counsel contended.

The lawyer for Sisodia, who was arrested on February 26 by the CBI, further said there's no documentary evidence of receiving kickbacks against him and the change in the excise policy is purely in normal course.

He said the matter of change in excise policy went to the Delhi LG and the finance secretary among others.

Sisodia's counsel told the court that all the offences alleged entails less than seven years of imprisonment in the case and any further incarceration is not justified.

The CBI, which opposed the bail plea of Sisodia, said he had dealt with 'unprecedented' 18 ministries and while he may not be a flight risk but he is definitely a risk for evidence destruction.

The counsel appearing for the CBI submitted that frequently changing of phones by the former deputy chief minister was not at all an innocent act but deliberately done for destruction of evidences in the

"Probe agency has 60 days to file the chargesheet in the case and if Manish Sisodia comes out, investigation will be seriously compromised," he



said, adding that he Sisodia is definitely in a position to influence witnesses and destrov evidence in the case.

On Monday, Sisodia's judicial custody was extended till April 3 by the Delhi court in the excise policy case being probed by the CBI.

He is at present in the Enforcement Directorate (ED) custody in a related case.

The ED had arrested Sisodia on March 9 evening in the Tihar jail, where he was lodged in connection with the case being probed by the CBI pertaining to alleged corruption in the formulation and implementation of the nowscrapped Delhi Excise Policy

On the Airport Express Line, the trains can reach a maximum speed of 90 kmph, and from Wednesday, it will be increased to 100 kmph. This has been done through technological enhancement, he

this increase in speed, they said. Currently, travelling from New Delhi metro station to Airport metro station takes around 25 minutes. With the increase in speed to 100 kmph, the travel time would reduce by three-four minutes, they said.

of riverine grasses including Kaas, Moonj and Vertiver, 70,000 bamboo saplings and 13,500 saplings of flowering plants including Gulmohar, Takoma, Amaltas, Dhak and Semal will adorn this stretch of the Yamuna bank, in the process helping restore the floodplains and rejuvenate the Yamuna through a sustainable and aesthetically appealing nat-

Addressing the people, LG Saxena said all departments and civic agencies of Delhi are working as a team to clean the Yamuna, which had turned into a polluted drain due to neglect and isolated efforts by agencies during the last 30

## NIA files first chargesheet against 12 accused in terror-gangster nexus case

PNS NEW DELHI

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Tuesday filed its first Chargesheet against 12 accused, found to have links with pro-Khalistani outfits and Pak-based conspirators, in one of the three terrorgangster nexus cases it is inves-

The agency said 10 other suspects are still under investigation for their role in the terror conspiracy, which included plans to eliminate certain leaders, singers and businessmen to terrorise people, extort money from them and create a sensa-

The NIA investigations have revealed linkages of the chargesheeted accused with Khalistan Tiger Force, a banned organisation, and its operative Arshdeep Singh Gill alias Arsh Dala, a listed 'Individual Terrorist'.

Besides being in contact with Pakistan-based conspirators, the accused were also in touch with pro-Khalistanis elements based in Canada and abroad, the NIA said.

Tuesday in Delhi related to dismantling of the gangster-terror network, along with their funding and support infrastruc-

These gangs were conspiring to carry out targeted killings and were also raising funds to carry out these and other terror activities, as part of a deep-rooted conspiracy amongst terrorists, gangsters, drug smugglers and their networks, operating from both within and outside the country.

The 12 accused chargesheeted in the case are Arsh Dala, Gaurav Patyal, Sukhpreet Buddha, Kaushal Choudhary, Amit Dagar, Naveen Bali, Chhotu Bhat, Asif



Khan, Jagga Takhatmal, Tillu Tajpuria, Bhupi Rana and Sandeep Bandar.

The Chargesheet against them followed six months of extensive searches and examination of around 100 members of different Organised Crime Support networks by the NIA at 91 locations in Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Delhi, across 25 districts, i.e. Ludhiana, Jalandhar, Mohali, Muktsar, Moga, Ferozepur, Bhatinda, Sangrur, Patiala in Punjab; Gurugram, Sirsa, Yamunanagar, Jhajjar, Rohtak, Rewari in Haryana: Outer North-west, North-East in and Baghpat, Bulandshahar, Pilibhit, Ghaziabad in Uttar Pradesh," it

The searches led to seizure of large amounts of incriminating materials. The NIA has also unearthed centres created for harbouring the gang members and stocking weapons for them in various places across Haryana and Punjab.

Around 20 weapons, 527 rounds of ammunition, 195 digital devices and 281 documents among others were seized in these raids and searches.

Seven look out circulars (LOCs) and 10 non-bailable

warrants (NBWs) have so far been issued as part of the investigations. Three immovable properties and three movattached/seized under Activities Unlawful (Prevention) Act. "It was revealed during the investigation that most of the

accused were, till recently, operating their own separate gangs involved in extortion rackets. They initially transformed into a gangsters' syndicate to expand their area of influence in other states, but soon ended up in a deadly criminal-terror nexus after being exposed to exploitation by terrorist elements," the

made the gangsters' syndicate an attractive choice for the able properties have been terrorist outfits, it said.

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Tuesday said it has made the first arrest in the NGO terror funding

Following comprehensive investigations into the NGO Terror funding case registered in October 2020, the NIA arrested Irfan Mehraj from Srinagar late on Monday.

Mehraj was a close associate of Khurram Parvez and was working with his organization, Jammu and Kashmir Coalition of Civil Societies (JKCCS), the agency said in a statement.

"Investigation revealed that the JKCCS was funding terror activities in the Valley and had also been in the propagation of a secessionist agenda in the Valley under the garb of protection of human rights,"

Involvement of some Valley-based NGOs, Trusts and Societies in funding of terror related activities is being probed in this case.

# Mamata to stage sit-in against Centre

CM says Bengal has not got even a penny for payment of MNREGA wages, PMAY funds

7ith her Government's so-called "integrity TRP" taking a hit as never before in the wake of multi-departmental recruitment scams (the school level appointment scandal to begin with) exploding in the face of the ruling Trinamool Congress packing a number of her senior ministerial and party colleagues off to jail, Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has decided to launch a movement against the BJP Government alleging depri-

Moments before leaving for Puri where she would offer prayers at the Jagannath Temple, Banerjee on Tuesday said she would soon start a two-day dharna against central deprivation. While in Odisha Banerjee is also likely to meet Chief Minister Naveen Pattanaik apparently to discuss the possibilities of an anti-BJP, anti-Congress Front ahead of the 2024 general elections.

"We are an ideal case of central deprivation ... Bengal has been subjected to a lot of deprivation and torment ... they (read the BJP Government) have not been paying our legitimate dues ... Why are they not clearing the funds for 100-days' work scheme and even the housing scheme ... what is the reason," Banerjee asked adding she would hold a sit-in demon-



stration at the statue of Baba Saheb Ambedkar in Kolkata.

"In protest against central deprivation and torture I will personally sit in a dharna for two days on March 29 and 30 ... the people must be told the kind of treatment we are getting ... Bengal is the only state that has not received a farthing from the Centre (towards the payment of MNREGA wages and PMAY funds) ... They did not earmark anything even in this year's

Budget," Banerjee said. Experts called it a desperate attempt to turn the popular attention from the SSC and other scams and rising discontent inside the party that has unnerved the top leadership to an extent that even senior ministers have been asked not to speak out of turn.

"The Centre on the one

hand has blocked the funds and on the other they are sending inspection teams and agencies" to brow-beat the State, Banerjee said reminding how the "agencies are being used for

political reasons only. Her dharna resolution notwithstanding, the sharp sting in her speech seemed missing on Tuesday, said experts wondering whether she was unwilling to provoke Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah.

## BJP schemes come from babus, Cong's from people: Rahul

Taking a dig at the BJP **▲** Government at the Centre, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday said the previous UPA Government's ambitious programmes such as the rural job guarantee scheme emerged from the people, whereas the Narendra-Modi-led dispensation's schemes were formulated by bureaucrats

Gandhi criticised the 'centralised' rule of the BJP-led government, comparing it with that of the former UPA govern-ments. Citing the MGNREGA scheme, which he said had been formulated based on people's inputs during UPA rule, he claimed that the present government's demonetisation decision came from Modi's mind and was implemented without consulting the people or the banking system.

He said this while interacting with the Congress-led UDF's representatives of the local bodies in this hill district, at Kalpetta.

While responding to a question from one of the participants, Rahul said, "I completely agree with you. A lot of schemes are done in a centralised manner, and they are actually not effective because panchayat participation in designing the scheme and thinking about the scheme

"If you look at the Congress party schemes, like MNREGA, and you compare them to BJP schemes, you will find that the schemes, you will find that the Congress party schemes emerged from the people, from the panchayats, and the BJP schemes emerged from the bureaucracy," the Wayanad MP

Gandhi then went on to elaborate about the launch of the MNREGA scheme, telling people how the idea emerged from how it was later conceptualised as a national scheme and expanded to the remaining parts of the country.

"MGNRÉGA emerged from the people of India. People demanded work, and the government responded to that idea. And it took many years for the scheme to be developed after talking to many, many different stakeholders. It was the scheme that emerged from the people of India. It was the wisdom of the people of India that created MGNREGA", Gandhi said.

He alleged that Modi had ridiculed MGNREGA, but was forced to expand the scheme himself when the country faced the COVID-19 crisis.

'When COVID came, this same Prime Minister, who was ridiculing MNREGA, was forced to expand MNREGA....

"When the Prime Minister came up with the idea of demonetisation, it came from his mind. He did not consult the people of India. He did not even consult the banking system," the Congress leader said.

During his interaction with the office bearers of local bodies, Gandhi also discussed developmental issues on the ground and matters related to the buffer zone for forests, human-animal conflict, waste management issues, and concerns regarding

## K'taka BJP leader who played role in Kharge's 2019 poll defeat to join Cong

 $B^{\mbox{\scriptsize JP}}$  leader Baburao Chinchansur, believed to be one of those who played a key role in defeating AICC president M Mallikarjun Kharge, in the 2019 Lok Sabha election, appears set to join the Congress in Karnataka.

Chinchansur, a prominent leader of the Koli-Kabbaliga community in the Kalyana Karnataka region, resigned from his post of Member of the Legislative Council on Monday.

He had represented Gurmitkal assembly constituency in Kalaburagi district from 2008 to Siddaramaiah-led Congress government earlier. However, he quit the Congress in 2018 after his defeat in the assembly election and joined the BJP.

As a BJP member, he is



viewed as one of the main leaders who played a key role in defeating Kharge in Gulbarga (Kalaburagi) Lok Sabha constituency. BJP candidate Umesh Jadhav, who too had resigned from the Congress and joined Congress sources said

Chinchansur is expected to join the party in the coming days.

Earlier this month, another BJP MLC Puttanna resigned from the Legislative Council and

Congress and was going back to the same party. He added that the BJP was strong in Gurmitkal and Chinchansur quitting the party would not have any effect

on the party's prospects there.

Assembly elections in Karnataka are due by May. BJP stalwart and former Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa refused to discuss the issue of Chinchansur's switching of loyalties, as he had already quit.

## 'Covid patients suffer mental health issues even a year after discharge'

The Government on Tuesday told Parliament L that shortness of breath, fatigue, and mental health issues have been observed in Covid patients one year after discharge. It also revealed that some patients have reported development of new symptoms such as hypertension and diabetes.

Replying to a query in Rajya Sabha, Minister of State for Health Bharati Pravin Pawar said participants of the National Clinical Registry of Covid who were followed for a year reported dyspnea or shortness of breath (18.6 per cent), fatigue (10.5 per cent) and mental health issues (9.3 per cent) after 30-60 days post-discharge.

She said that Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has sanctioned studies on post-Covid sequelae to explore the possibility of a study of the association of major complications and



6.6 per cent and 9 per cent, respectively in 2,192 participants, Pawar said.

Translational Health Science and Technology Institute (THSTI), an autonomous Institute under the Department of Biotechnology, has revealed in their preliminary analysis of the data that approximately 2 per cent of the participants At one-year follow-up, dyspnea, fatigue, and such as hypertension and diabetes, she stated.

## Centre warns Govt employees against joining OPS strike

vision empowering the employees to go on strike. The Supreme Court has also agreed in several judgments that going on a strike is a grave misconduct under the conduct rules and that misconduct by the government employees is required to be dealt with in accordance with the law," the order said.

Any employee going on strike in any form, including

protest, would face the consequences which, besides deduction of wages, may also include appropriate disciplinary action, it said. "The central government employees under your ministry/departments may, therefore, be suitably informed of the aforesaid instructions under the conduct rules issued by this department and other regulations upheld by the Supreme court. This may be dissuaded from resorting to strike in any form including protest," it asked all the central government departments.

Instructions may be issued not to sanction Casual Leave or other kind of leave to employees if applied for, during the period of the proposed protest/strike and ensure that the willing employees are allowed hindrance free entry into the office premises, the order said.

## **Elusive fugitive**

Khalistani leader Amritpal Singh dodges 80,000 Punjab cops, and yet Kejriwal lauds CM Mann

olitics, Niccolo Machiavelli said, has no relation to morals. Often, it also has no relation to facts, commonsense, and decency. Nothing else explains Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's praise for his Punjab counterpart and party colleague Bhagwant Mann for the latter's handling of the situation arising out of Khalistani leader Amritpal Singh's inflammatory remarks and violent activities. Amritpal has the temerity to take on the entire official machinery of Punjab. The Central Government believes that Amritpal is a Pakistani agent. He openly supports Khalistan, makes anti-national statements, and disregards the Indian Constitution; his followers, protesting against the arrest of one of Amritpal's supporters, attack a police station, leaving many cops injured. The result? The cops meekly endure the assaults; and his follower is released the next day. When an attempt is made to arrest Amritpal, he dodges the police. Even



after a number of days, in which many of his supporters were arrested and many arms recovered from them, police are unable to find him. And yet, Kejriwal has the cheek to say, "I want to congratulate Punjab CM Bhagwant Mann for maintaining the law and order situation in a patient and mature way." Congratulate for what? Letting a non-entity emerge as a great rebel? Restraining the police to act against an anti-national character so that he grows bigger, becomes Bhindranwale 2.0? Letting violent Khalistanis attack a police station — and getting away with it? Party camaraderie and partisanship are important but more important is national interest. Instead of lauding his party leader and Punjab CM,

Kejriwal should pay heed to what the Punjab and Haryana High Court said on Tuesday. Blasting the Punjab police for their inability to arrest Amritpal who heads an outfit called Waris Punjab De, the court said, "You have 80,000 cops. What were they doing? How did Amritpal Singh escape?" The Punjab Police informed the high court that, in a major crackdown against Amritpal Singh and his outfit, they arrested 120 of his supporters, but that didn't impress the court. And rightly so. He should have been under watch — very strict watch. After all, he not only promotes secession but also assassination. Former Punjab CM Beant Singh was blown up by Dilawar Singh, who acted as a human bomb. Amritpal Singh says that many Dilawars are ready in Punjab. But the Mann Government did not do that. Bharatiya Janata Party national executive member Sunil Jakhar correctly said, "The operation that could have been carried out without any force and show-off is now today being done in front of the whole country." It looks like the Aam Aadmi Party, which rules Punjab, is weighing political gains and losses before doing anything against Amritpal Singh. AAP leaders became successful by making all manner of statements and distributing freebies. But you need more than fiscal profligacy to tackle separatism.

# Fake diagnosis, fake prescription



Peddlers of the vehicles-pollute-Delhi narrative are silent over the most comprehensive study which blames biomass burning for the mess


f there is anything more pol-luted than Delhi's air, it is the discourse on the environment. For years, we were told that vehicular emissions were the root cause of dirty air in the national capital. Now, the most authoritative study on the subject has pointed out that the real reason is something else: biomass burning. The proponents of the vehicles-pollute-Delhi narrative are conspicuous by their silence on the matter.

According to the US Energy Information Administration, 'Biomass is a renewable organic material that comes from plants and animals." It includes wood and wood processing wastes, agricultural crops and waste materials, biogenic materials in municipal solid waste, and animal manure and human sewage.

The study, led by the Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur, had contributions from 19 scholars and experts from the Physical Research Laboratory, IIT Delhi, the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), the Paul Scherrer Institute (PSI), Switzerland, and University of Helsinki, Finland. Researcher Suneeti Mishra and Prof Sachchida Nand Tripathi, both from the Department of Civil Engineering, IIT Kanpur, coauthored the paper.

In the study, published in the prestigious Nature Geoscience journal, the scholars "observed intense and frequent nocturnal particle growth events during haze development in Delhi from measurements of aerosols and gases during January-February at the Indian Institute of Technology in Delhi... We estimate that this process is responsible for 70 per cent of the total particle-number concentration during haze.' It went on to say "that the

condensation of primary organic vapours from biomass burning is the leading cause of the observed growth." It further said, "As uncontrolled biomass burning for residential heating and cooking is rife in the Indo-Gangetic plain, we expect this rowth mechanism to de a source of ultrafine particles, affecting the health of 5 per cent of the world's population and impacting the



Switzerland-based IQAir's recent World Air Quality Report confirmed this. It ranked Delhi and Rajasthan's Bhiwadi fourth on the list of 50 most polluted cities in the world in 2022. In addition, six Indian cities figure in the top 10 most polluted cities, 14 in the top 20, 39 in the top 50, and 65 in the top 100. In 2021, there were 61 in the top 100.

No one disputes that the quality of air is extremely poor in not just the national capital but also in entire northern India. It is a diagnosis that is not just wrong but also dangerously misleading. In addition, there has been a persistent effort on the part of doctrinaire environmentalists to distract attention from the real cause. It is not that a non-vehic-

ular source of pollution was never suspected or detected. In July 2021, for instance, a study by IIT Kanpur's Tripathi found that in summer, 52 per cent of Delhi's PM 2.5 concentration was because of dust.

Yet, the entire debate about the cause of air pollution revolved around vehicles, especially cars. This was the reason under Arvind Kejriwal opted for the odd-even scheme to

Nothing could be further from the truth. According to the latest National Family Health Survey-5, just about 8 per cent of Indian households own cars. In Delhi, one in five households owns a car. In comparison, in Helsinki, the third cleanest city in the world, there are more than two cars for every individual. In general, Western nations have more cars per household than in India, and yet the air there is much cleaner than in our country

At the heart of the problem of air pollution in India is not automobile density (which is low anyway) but illegal urbanisation; slums and unauthorised localities are destroying our cities. The consequences are rampant encroachments, unregulated and dangerous construction, solid waste dumping, contamination and death of water bodies, drying of aquifers, and countless more. Unsurprisingly, many areas become dust bowls—and are shrouded in a haze caused by biomass burning.

Addressing these issues presupposes a fundamental change in governance and politics. This certainly involves actions that would be disliked

by the beneficiaries of chaotic urbanisation: the residents, the local authorities, the local politicians, the bleeding-heart activists, even certain sections of the media. Anybody determined to clean up the mess

runs the risk of being brand-

ed as 'anti-poor,' heartless, etc. It begins with a win-win situation. The original landowners get much higher prices than they would have got had they sold it as farm-land; those with meager resources get a house of their own; the officials concerned get bribes; local politicians provide protection from legal action and get votes in return; and all manner of employers

get a cheap workforce. Few are interested in the real analysis of the situation, for that would mean challenging the dogmas of received wisdom.

The flourishing tribe of activists is certainly not interested in anything that hurts their shibboleths. Besides, it is easier to blame everything on those who are better off, like car owners. So, fake analysis continues, with horrifying consequences, as underlined by the IQAIr report.

# Missing the chorus chirping



It is far better to hear the chirping, rather than the numb silence. The sparrows have disappeared so quietly that no one noticed them go

A little bird, with plumage brown, Beside my window flutters down, A moment chirps its little strain, Ten taps upon my window-pane, And chirps again, and hops along, To call my notice to its song; But I work on, nor heed its lay, Till, in neglect, it flies away.

n my childhood, I remember the above lines from the first African American poet, Paul Laurence Dunbar (1872-1906). Giving these spunky naughty birds broken rice grains to feed on, watching them wait impatiently for their food. This was as grandma and mother would clean grain in the open veranda – the sparrows were a part of our lives back in the hills. Ever since this friendly companion of ours is missing from the metropolitan cities, the poem seems to hold more relevance as the poet observes that this "Bird of peace and hope and love" has left us, since, "We in traffic's rush and din/Too deep engaged to let them in/With deadened heart and sense plod on/Nor know

our loss till they are gone". The sparrows have disappeared so quietly that no one has noticed them go. Either that or in the din of city life, gradually edging towards evidence from a cave in



people have been too busy to even notice their choral chirping, let alone miss their presence. The house sparrow (Passer domesticus) is no longer what it used to be – our 'common' friend. According to scientists, sparrows thrived around human beings and where grain was abundant. Lack of nesting sites in modern concrete buildings, disappearing kitchen gardens and a general apathy of humans towards this small but attractive bird have deprived them of their general habitat.

We remembered this 'common' household member on "World Sparrow Day" on March 20 - a result of a vigorous campaign by scientistconservationist Mohammad Dilawar, founder of "Natura Forever". But we also need to be serious as this little bird is

extinction and is listed in the Red List of endangered species of the International Ûnion for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), as well as of the Royal Society for Protection of Birds (RSPB), United Kingdom.

There is a sharp decline in many places in India such as Punjab, Haryana, West Bengal, Kerala, Gujarat, Rajasthan, etc. However, a ray of hope has emerged with the "State of India's Birds 2000" report, which suggests that the population of House Sparrows has been fairly stable for the past 25 years. The report is based on 10 million observations contributed by over 15,500 birdwatchers since 2000, to an online portal called eBird. It suggests that the population of House Sparrows has been fairly stable for the past 25 years.

The history of the house sparrow is also fascinating. It was the ancient Romans who introduced the house sparrow to Europe from North Africa and Eurasia. Scientific studies also point to the astonishing fact that wherever there is a human population, sparrows follow them there. Fossil

Bethlehem dating back 4,00,000 years suggests that the house sparrow shared its space with early humans. Conservationists attribute the decline in the population of house sparrows to the unfriendly architecture of our homes. This is because of chemical fertilisers in our crops, noise pollution that disturbs the acoustic environment and noxious exhaust fumes from vehicles. A report further attributed the depleting population of sparrows to the increased use of packed food, insecticides in farming, and changing lifestyles. This resulted in inadequate food supplies for the birds. They also feel that unlike pigeons that can make nests on ledges, sparrows need cavities to build their nests. Since the newly constructed defective architectural matchbox style buildings don't have cavities, sparrows are left homeless.

Ornithologists suggest that people should provide some places in their homes for shelter, where sparrows can easily make their own

nests and lay their eggs.

### **NEP AND THE FUTURE OF SCHOOL EDUCATION**

It is a visionary dcoument that takes school education to the next level



he National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 lays out an educational vision with a lot of promise for the future of education in India. One of the things it suggests is a revised structure for school education in India. known as the 5+3+3+4 model. This proposed structure proposes that we replace the existing 10+2 structure that has been in place for several decades. This is in order to provide a more flexible and holistic approach to education. Let's take a closer look at the 5+3+3+4 model, how it differs from the previous structure, and why it might be better for education in India in the future.

#### The 5 + 3 + 3 + 4 Model

The 5+3+3+4 model is the latest structure for school education in India that is proposed in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The "5" in the model refers to the foundational stage, which includes the first five years of schooling, from ages 3 to 8. The focus at this stage is on play and activity-based learning, with an emphasis on the development of cognitive and social-emotional skills. The first "3" in the model refers to the preparatory stage, which encompasses the next three years of schooling, from ages 8 to 11. The focus at this stage is on introduction to language, mathematics, science, social studies, and the arts, with an emphasis on learning through inquiry and discovery. The next "3" in the model relates to the middle stage, which includes the next three years of schooling, from ages 11 to 14. The focus during this stage is on deepening the students' understanding of core subjects. In addition, they are encouraged to expand their learning to include additional languages, the arts, and other elective subjects. The "4" in the model refers to the secondary stage, which includes the final four years of schooling, from ages 14 to 18. The focus during this stage is on providing students with a broad-based education that prepares them for higher education, as well as for vocational or technical education, if they choose to pursue that path.



#### Starting with holistic and moving to specialisation


One of the main advantages of this structure is that it suggests that the educational journey starts with a more holistic or trans-disciplinary approach to learning when students are younger, and then over the years progresses to a more specialised or disciplinary approach.

A holistic/trans-disciplinary approach to early education allows for a holistic and comprehensive understanding of a subject, as it integrates multiple disciplines and perspectives. This approach is especially beneficial for young children as it helps them to make connections between different areas of knowledge and develop critical thinking skills

#### Starting with Strong Foundations and moving to Better Choice

Strong foundational learning leads to a more equitable education, where all children have the opportunity to reach their full potential regardless of their background. The revised model places more emphasis on key foundational skills like literacy and numeracy. Educational research has shown us that gaps in literacy in early childhood can result in an educational 'Matthew Effect' of sorts. This is i.e., the high achievers get better, and the low achievers get worse over time. The NEP also emphasises the role of play and activity-based learning during the early years of schooling. Research has shown that play and activity-based learning can have a positive impact on the development of cognitive and social-emotional skills in young children. One of the main differences between the 5+3+3+4model and the previous 10+2 structure is that the revised model focuses on providing a more flexible and holistic approach to education. The traditional 10+2 model of education often results in students being forced to make early decisions about their future careers, which can limit their options later on. The revised education policy aims to address this issue by providing more flexibility in the structure of school education. # Trust Prachanda to build relations with Nepal



With Prachanda at the helm in Kathmandu, New Delhi can start with a clean slate. A fresh approach can put Indo-Nepal relations back on track



n Monday, Nepalese Prime Minister Prachanda won the confidence vote to start his third term. India has had far better relations with Maoist leader Prachanda than with former PM KP Oli of CPN (UML). Nepal's pro-China policy took a visible turn during Oli's term. He politically exploited India's apparent rejection of the Constitution, then Foreign Secretary S Jaishankar's virtual diktat to alter and not promulgate it and the 53-daylong and painful border blockade. Oli signed agreements with China on trade and infrastructure, thus replacing India as the country of last resort.

India's inept handling of the Kalapani border dispute allowed Oli to unilateral ly incorporate the Kalapani-Lipulekh-Limpiadora areas in Nepal with an unprecedented 100 per cent parliamentary vote. Zealous and overconfident, he accused India of cheating Nepal and hurled insults at us. The war of words abated only after New Delhi launched its charm offensive by sending R&AW chief Goyal, former Chief of Army Staff Gen Naravane, and former foreign secretary Shringla.

This helped mend relations. The visits paid off and it was business as usual, as Oli realised that no Nepal government could tread on India's toes and survive. Oli's transformation, rather than his taming by New Delhi, was a lesson in

Oli's survival as Prime Minister was aided by President Bidya Debi Bhandari (UML). She violated norms and even the Constitution by ensuring Oli's longevity as leader of the House till the Supreme Court intervened, not once but twice. The new pro-China Left alliance collapsed much to

the dismay of Beijing which had invested considerable resources in its survival.

Third time Prime Minister Prachanda has played the long game. He was compelled by the former prime minister Sher Bahadur Deuba, who served five terms, to jump ship to support Oli as Deuba vacillated offering prime-ministership to Prachanda. For Prachanda's party, the Maoists, had won only 32 seats in the elections.

Still Prachanda claimed he commanded the support of 64 seats. When Deuba hesitated, without blinking, he joined the perennial foe Oli. But Prachanda was never comfortable with his decision to join Oli and had sought to return to Deuba. The opportunity was provided by President Paudel. Prachanda argued that when Oli became Prime Minister, the top three positions — of the PM, the President and the Speaker - would be from the same party, leading to authoritarian rule.

Prachanda is no longer a big fan of China. During the Civil War era, Maoists fancied Mao and other communist leaders but saw communist states on the decline. He is pro-Nepal and knows that Nepal can benefit from two fastgrowing economies.

Unfortunately for him, India-China relations have plummeted after the Chinese aggression in Ladakh. When he first became prime minister in 2008, his first visit was to China for the Olympics.

But his first political visit was to India, for which he has a soft corner. Nine out of ten years he directed the Maoist insurgency, mostly from Noida, UP. Maoists used to say nasty things about India and the US during those days, but acknowledged India's role in ending the conflict and paving the path

for peace and democracy.
Prachanda will shortly expand his cabinet to accommodate the 11 parties that support him. As he replaces his foreign minister, the parliamentary foreign affairs committee will be responsible for making a decision on the Agnipath Scheme, which has been pending for nine months now. The feedback from Nepal is not encouraging, as the ruling party will be constrained by UML and other communists from supporting the four-year recruitment scheme with no postretirement outlets.

Communists in Nepal have always criticised Gorkhas joining foreign armies, especially the Indian Army. In addition, the Prachanda Government's support for the scheme drew criticism from UML for being pro-India.

Agnipath is discriminatory and in breach of the tripartite agreement 1947. This is because Indian Agniveers will have 10 per cent reservation in the Border Security Force and the Central Industrial Security Force, but Nepalese citizens are not eligible for these organisations.

People also say that 90 per cent of those who join the Indian Army

are Jan Jatis and not Brahmins and Chhetris who constitute decisionmaking at political and bureaucratic levels. They will not worry about the Indian and Nepali Armies' relationships and history. India could have helped end the problem by simply removing the Nepali Gorkhas from Agnipath.

On 10 March was Nepal Army Day. The Nepal Embassy commemorated the event by highlighting Prime Minister Narendra Modi's speech in the Nepalese Parliament: "India has fought no war in which Nepali blood has not been shed." Given the warped Agniveer idea, soon there may be no Nepalese joining the Army. It's time Modi's most trusted Foreign Minister Jaishankar devoted more time on Nepal, further fostering India's Neighbourhood First Policy.

Prachanda's first visit abroad is to India next month, though China's Ambassador Chen Song tried to get him to China first. India's impeccable conduct of noninterference during elections in stark contrast to traditional charges of micro-management in the past has won it kudos.

With Prachanda at the helm, New Delhi can start with a clean slate. Just as Jaishankar has won over Sri Lanka with economic sustenance, he can begin the recovery programme in Nepal. With Deuba as leader of a single largest party and a prime minister, India has a winning hand to play the game. The ball is in Jaishankar's

# Schooling and underage marriages

There Should be more efforts to create an enabling framework for improving girls' enrollment in schools, instead of penal actions

ssam is on a vigorous Adrive through penal actions under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act and the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act (PCMA). Over 4,000 cases have been registered and more than 3,000 people arrested, including many fathers, brothers and Muslim and Hindu priests, as 'facilitators'. The Assam Chief Minister vowed to eliminate the menace of child marriages in the state by 2026.

Amid massive public outrage, the Gauhati High Court criticised such large-scale arrests with non-bailable charges, and insisted on 'society-driven change'. The Opposition claimed it was for 'political gains'.

Many legal experts vouch



new norms and practices. India had the Child Marriage Restraint Act, 1929, subsequently replaced by the existing PCMA, 2006, raising the minimum age of marriage to 18 years for women and 21 years for men.

for the law as a means to set

Now, a move is afoot to make it gender-neutral at 21. It was claimed by the votaries of the amendment Bill that the move would enhance girls' agency, their reproductive autonomy, and reduce gender inequality. However, opponents contended that "it is not a sufficient condition to bring in changes in the mindsets of people," as it fails to address the underlying socio-economic and cultural factors that push many resource-poor families,

who are also the worst victims

of emergencies, such as internal conflicts, natural disasters or the pandemic, into underage marriage of girls, either to avoid higher dowry or as a way to 'protect' the girls.

A national network of

adolescents from rural and semi-urban areas suggested to the task force set up for the purpose that focus should be more on "the disadvantaged rural contexts through adequate resourcing for quality education, employment, safety, mobility, and the freedom to choose when, and who to marry, as child marriages are closely tied to low levels of education and poverty"

While, as per the NCRB data, an abysmally low number of cases booked under the PCMA, only 785 in 2020, and a study by the Partners for Law

in Development found that 65 per cent of them are filed by disapproving parents against eloping daughters, and male partners of their choice have been punished as criminals. Child rights activists fear the proposed legislation would further increase the misuse of the law, criminalising all adolescent sexuality.

However, in today's society, the existing PCMA has undoubtedly created some awareness, encouraging many girls to stop or delay their marriages. The successive NFHS data also registered a declining trend in the proportion of girls marrying below 18 years from 47 per cent in NFHS-3 (2005-06) to 27 per cent in NFHS-4 (2015-16), and, now, to 23 per cent in NFHS-5 (2020-21).

Studies also ruled out that

early marriage is linked to high fertility. In most of the states, including states with relatively high prevalence rates of child marriages, fertility rates

have been dropping.
The NFHS-5 data corroborated that mother and child health indicators like MMR. have decreased by 80 per cent (113 per lakh live births in 2016-18 from 556 in 1990), and, the IMR by 69 per cent (35 per 1,000 births in 2019-21, from 114 in 1990). A parliamentary question in 2021, confirmed that there is no credible data to suggest that child marriage is the major reason for affecting the IMR and MMR. Instead, factors like health, nutrition, and lack of medical facilities adversely impact them.

Moreover, a correlation 13.5 per cent, 10.4 per cent,

study in 109 districts of 19 states by the CRY, analysing NFHS-5 data and Education Ministry's Performance Grading Index scores of Districts (PGI-D) (2019-20) on indicators like effective classroom transactions, infrastructure and students' entitlements, school safety, etc, found that "education remains the most powerful tool to curb child marriages." For instance, in Uttar Pradesh, the districts with comparatively higher percentage of women having 10 or more years of schooling like Lucknow (51.9 per cent), Gautam Buddha Nagar (51.9 per cent), Varanasi (55 per cent), and Allahabad (47.6 per cent) had significantly lower percentages of child marriage cases—9.9 per cent,

and 13.8 per cent, respectively. While districts like Badaun (21.6 per cent), Lakhimpur-Kheri (28.7 per cent), and Kaushambi (31.9 per cent) with lower percentage of women having 10 or more years of schooling, had higher percentage of child marriage at 22.9 per cent, 19.7 per cent, and 17.6 per cent, respectively. Over 10 million girls have been married as a result of the pandemic, according to UNICEF's report last year. As an antidote, it urged nations to "invest more in girls' educa-tion, secondary education, in particular." In addition, it was found that "better educated women tend to participate more in the formal labor market, earn higher incomes, and thus, lift their families out of

## Sunak urged to act over English test scandal

A group of international students, including many from India, have delivered a petition to British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak urging him to act against the "unjust" revocation of their visas following an English test scandal. The issue dates back to 2014 when a BBC 'Panorama' investigation showed some cheating had occurred at two of the UK's testing centres for a compulsory language test required for visas.

The UK government responded by a widespread crackdown on such centres, which had the fallout of the revocation of tens of thousands of students' visas linked with those centres. The Migrant Voice voluntary group has been supporting the students impacted and coordinated the latest petition delivered at 10 Downing Street on Monday.

'This is one of the biggest scandals in contemporary British history. The initial government reaction was unjust and has been allowed to drag on for years," said Nazek Ramadan, director of Migrant Voice. "It could have been resolved by a simple solution, such as allowing the tests to be retaken. The



students came here to get a world-class education and best student experience in the world, but instead their lives have been wrecked. It is time for the government to step in and end this nightmare. All it takes to bring this to an end is leader-ship," she said. With no right to stay, work or in a few cases to appeal, most of the accused students returned home. Those who stayed to clear their names have struggled with homelessness, huge legal fees, stressinduced illnesses and have missed family weddings, births and deaths, the petition appeals. Parliamentary and watchdog reports over the years have highlighted some flaws in the Home Office evidence used in the case in the past. Although some students won their legal challenges, scores of other stu-dents – many of them Indian –

Migrant Voice is now underlining the importance of Sunak "addressing the injustice at a time when numbers of students and migrant workers form part of UK-India trade negotiations".

The group has been run-ning the #MyFutureBack cam-paign for the affected students for over nine years now and urging the UK government to allow these students the chance to clear their names of alleged cheating. Sarbjeet is a 46-yearold Indian student who has been separated from her children for 13 years, as she feels she cannot return home to India with the allegations hanging over her.

Sanjoy, another Indian student impacted, is being sued by the company that sponsored him and has also been denied the ability to go to the US because his visa withdrawal prevents him from resuming his studies in another country.

#### Months after Pak floods, millions lack safe water

 $\Gamma$ he United Nations children's agency on Tuesday warned that after last summer's devas-tating floods, 10 million people in Pakistan, including children, still live in flood-affected areas without access to safe drinking

The statement from UNICEF underscored the dire situation in impoverished Pakistan, a country with a population of 220 million that months later is still struggling with the consequences of the flooding, as well as a spiraling economic crisis. The floods, which experts attribute in part to climate change, killed 1,739 people, including 647 children and 353 women.

So far, less than half of UNICEF's funding appeal for Pakistan — 45 per cent of USD 173.5 million — has been met. According to the agency, before the floods struck last June, water from only 36 per cent of Pakistan's water system was considered safe for human con-

Sumption.

The floods damaged most of the water pipelines systems in affected areas, forcing more than 5.4 million people, including 2.5 million children, to rely solely on contaminated water from ponds and wells, UNICEF said. "Safe drinking water is not a privilege, it is a basic human right," said Abdullah Fadil, the UNICEF representative in Pakistan. "Yet, every day, millions of girls and boys in Pakistan are fighting a losing battle against preventable waterborne diseases and the consequential malnutrition."

"We need the continued support of our donors to provide safe water, build toilets and deliver vital sanitation services to these children and families who need them the most," Fadil added. Amid the crisis, Pakistan faces uncertainty about a bailout from the International Monetary Fund. Analysts say the revival of the USD 6 IMF bailout, which was signed in 2019, would help Pakistan. If the global lender released a key installment of the package, it would encourage other inter-national financial institutions to help the country, they say.

#### Thailand polls on May 14

Bangkok (AP): Thailand's general election will take place on May 14, the country's election regulator said Tuesday, one day after the dissolution of Parliament initiated by Prime Minister Prayuth Chan-ocha, who is seeking a fresh term. The Election Commission said registration of candidates would begin April 3.

The election will pit the popular opposition Pheu Thai party, backed by billionaire populist Thaksin Shinawatra, against parties representing the conservative establishment and closely linked to the military, which has staged two coups in the last two decades. Other parties are likely to win enough seats to be wooed to join a coalition government. Prayuth dissolved Parliament just ahead of the end of the four-year term of the House of Representatives.

Early dissolution allows candidates for the lower house to switch party affiliations just 30 days before the election, instead of the usual 90 days. Parties led and backed by seats in every election since 2001, but been fiercely opposed by the conservatives, who have undermined several governments headed by Thaksin and his allies by utilising legal rulings by the judiciary and military coups in 2006 and 2014.

Pheu Thai's top candidate for the prime minister's post is his 36-year-old daughter Paetongtarn Shinawatra, whom polls show to be the most popular choice by a large

## **Protective bail for Imran in 2 terror cases**

A two-judge bench comprising Justice Shehbaz Rizvi and Justice Farooq Haider granted protective bail to the Pakistan Tehreeke-Insaf (PTI) chief in the terrorism cases till March 27.

The former premier also appeared before the Lahore High Court's (LHC) Justice Baqir Naqvi in the NAB investigation in Toshakhana case. The court granted him protective bail till next Tuesday. "Mr Khan told the court today that he came to the court 'secretly' as

a heavy contingent of police was deployed near to his house to stop him from reaching the court," a court official told PTI after the hearing.

Khan, 70, said he has no issue to appear in any case but during his appearance in court the government should make sure no chaos is created. The number of cases registered against the PTI chief in the last 11 months of the PMLN-led government has swelled to around 100. Unlike his recent appearances in courts, Khan on Tuesday was not accompained by party workers to the LHC from his Zaman Park residence here. Washington (AP): Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen is trying project calm after regional bank failures, saying the U.S. banking system "sound" but additional rescue arrangements "could be warranted" if any new failures at smaller institutions pose a risk to financial stability. Yellen, in an excerpt of remarks prepared for delivery to the American Bankers Association on Tuesday, says that overall "the situation is stabilising."

"And the U.S. banking system remains sound, Ýellen says. Yellen's remarks come after a series of troubling bank developments this month. Silicon Valley Bank, based in Santa Clara, California, failed on March 10 after depositors rushed to withdraw money amid anxiety over the bank's health. It was the second-largest bank collapse in U.S. history. Regulators convened over the following weekend and announced that New York-based Signature Bank also had failed.

# IMF approves \$3 billion in financial assistance for debt-ridden Sri Lanka

3 billion bailout programme to help debt-ridden Sri Lanka overcome its economic crisis and catalyse financial support from other development partners, a move welcomed by Colombo on Tuesday as a "historic milestone" in the critical period. International Monetary Fund's Executive Board approved on Monday a 48month extended arrangement under its Extended Fund Facility (EFF) with an amount of SDR 2.286 billion (about USD 3 billion), according to a statement. Special Drawing Rights (SDR) are supplementary foreign exchange reserve assets defined and maintained by the International Monetary Fund (IMF). Sri Lanka has been hit hard by a catastrophic economic and humanitarian

The economy is facing significant challenges stemming from pre-existing vulnerabilities and policy missteps in the leadup to the crisis, further aggravated by a series of external shocks, the IMF said. The EFFsupported programme aims to



restore Sri Lanka's macroeconomic stability and debt sustainability, mitigate the economic impact on the poor and vulnerable, safeguard financial sector stability, and strengthen governance and growth potential, said the statement. The Executive Board's decision will enable an immediate disbursement equivalent to SDR 254

million (about USD 333 million) and catalyse financial support from other development partners, it said. 

The meetings came after a week in which China and Japan both enjoyed diplomatic successes that have emboldened their foreign policy. Kishida, who is to chair the Group of

Kyiv (AP): Russian and Ukrainian officials on Tuesday gave conflicting accounts of what appeared to be a brazen attack late Monday on Russian cruise missiles being transported by train in the occupied Ukrainian Crimean

A Ukrainian military spokesperson indicated that Kyiv was behind the explosion that reportedly destroyed multiple Kalibr cruise missiles near the town of Dzhankoi in northern Crimea, while stopping short of directly claiming responsibility. Natalia Humeniuk, the spokeswoman for Úkraine's southern operational command, described the strike as a signal to Russia that it should leave the Black Sea peninsula it illegally took from Ukraine in 2014.

Speaking on Ukrainian TV, Humeniuk pointed out Dzhankoi's importance as a railway

junction and said that "right now, the way ahead (for Russian forces in Crimea) is clear — they need to make their way out by rail already."

A vague statement by Ukraine's military intelligence agency on Monday said that multiple missiles carried by rail and destined for submarine launch had been destroyed, without saying outright that Ukraine was responsible or what weapon had been used.

However, the agency implied that Kyiv was behind the blast, saying it furthers "the process of Russia's demilitarisation, and prepares the Ukrainian peninsula of Crimea for de-occupa-

## 'Bard' set for next stage

New York (AP): Google announced Tuesday it's allowing more people to interact with Bard," the artificially intelligent chatbot the company is building to counter Microsoft's early lead in a pivotal battleground of technology. In Bard's next stage, Google is opening a waitlist to use an AI tool that's similar to the ChatGPT technology Microsoft began deploying in its Bing search engine to much fanfare last month. And last week, Microsoft embedded more AIpowered technology in its word processing, spreadsheet and slide presentation programmes with a new feature called Copilot. Until now, Bard had only been available to a small group of "trusted testers" hand-

picked by Google. The Mountain View, California, company, which is owned by Alphabet Inc., isn't saying how many people will be given access to Bard in the next step of the technology's development.

Initial applicants will be limited to the U.S. and the U.K. before Google offers Bard in more countries. Google is treading carefully with the rollout of its AI tools, in part because it has more to lose if the technology spits out inaccurate information or takes its users down dark corridors. That's because Google's dominant search engine has become a de facto gateway to the internet for billions of people, raising the risk of a massive backlash that could tarnish its image and undercut its ad-driven business if the technology behaves badly Despite the technology's pitfalls Bard still offers "incredible benefits" such as "jumpstarting human productivity, creativity and curiosity," Google said in a blog post that two of its vice presidents - Sissie Hsiao and Eli Collins — wrote with assistance from Bard.



## 'Office space leasing may fall 25-30% this yr in top 6 cities on slow demand'

easing of office space across 25-30 per cent this calendar year to 35-38 million square feet on subdued demand, according to Colliers India and FICCI.

Property consultant Colliers India and industry body FICCI released a report 'Emerging Trends and Opportunities in Office Sector — 2023'.

Gross office space leasing rose to 50.3 million square feet in 2022 across six cities from 32.9 million square feet in the previous year on better demand. These six cities are Delhi-

NCR, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Chennai and Pune. The report said that in an optimistic scenario, India's office

sector is likely to see about 35-38 million square feet of gross leasing in 2023. The consultant expects that the economic headwinds would

ease and not cause a significant dent to overall occupiers' confi-

It expects a significant



increase in leasing in the latter half of this year with corporates likely to close leasing decisions that were put on hold temporarily.

On the contrary, the Colliers-FICCI report pointed out that in a pessimistic scenario, the impact of economic headwinds would be prolonged, delaying a recovery in demand.

In the optimistic scenario, Colliers expects 2023 leasing to 30-33 million square feet at a gross level.

The report suggested that while the office market in 2023 looks uncertain currently, it

might bounce back with relative ease despite the global headwinds and other externalities. pick up in the second half of the year, led by global capability cen-

tres, BFSI companies and startups with sound business models, the report said. "The growth in traditional and flex spaces has been robust in 2022 as occupiers were more

upbeat about leasing space and expanding their footprint. In 2023, despite the office market being riddled with uncertainty, the office sector is poised for growth, provided the economic environment remains bright," Peush Jain, Managing Director (Office Services) at Colliers India, said. "We do not expect the leas-

ing numbers to fall below the peak pandemic levels of leasing even in a pessimistic scenario, Jain said The key fundamentals of the

office market will follow the trajectory of demand and supply to maintain a balance in the market, he added.

## India misses RE capacity target due to low solar rooftop: Par panel

PTI N NEW DELHI

Aparliamentary panel has attributed low installation of solar roof-top and wind energy projects as key reasons for the shortfall in achieving India's renewable energy capacity target of 175 GW by 2022. India set an ambitious tar-

get of installing 175 GW of renewable energy capacity by the year 2022, which included 100 GW from solar, 60 GW from wind, 10 GW from bio-power and 5 GW from small hydro-

However, a renewable energy capacity of 120.90 GW has been installed in the country as of 31st December 2022 which is about 69 per cent of the overall target, the Standing Committee on Energy said in a report.

"Keeping in view the fact



capacity has increased by more than 236 per cent since 2014, this is indeed a commendable achievement. However, it should also be mentioned that whatever shortfall has occurred in achievement of the target that is because of low installation of solar roof-tops and wind energy projects," the committee said. Keeping in view India's

non-fossil fuel based energy capacity to 500 GW by the year 2030, the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy must ramp up its pace for timely achievement of targets, it suggested. A strict timeline should be

imposed for approvals/rejection of applications, installation of net-meter, inspection of the system, etc. By the discoms and reasons should mandatorily be provided by them in case of rejection of application on the national portal, the committee

### 6,199 Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process started, 611 successful: Govt



IANS NEW DELHI

Since the provisions relating to Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP) came into force on December 1, 2016, a total of 6,199 CIRPs have started, as on the end of December 2022, the Parliament was informed on Tuesday. As of December 2022, 611 CIRPs have

resulted in resolution, where the creditors have recovered 30.40 per cent of their admitted claims, Minister of State for Corporate Affairs, Rao Inderjit Singh told the Rajya Sabha in a written reply to a question seeking to know the number of companies which have utilized the provisions of Însolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC), 2016 since it came into force. On a question whether there is a delay in the

completion of the process within stipulated time, he said that the average time taken (after excluding the time excluded by the Adjudicating Authority) for resolution of the 611 resolved cases is 482 days. Insolvency resolution process under the IBC is a market driven process and the outcome depends on market forces. Further, the time taken for resolution depends on several factors, including the nature of business, business cycles, market sentiments, litigations and marketing effort, he added. To the question on the list of defaulters who

have availed 'haircuts' above Rs 10 crore, the Minister said: "As of December, 2022, out of the 611 resolved CIRPs, in 477 cases there is a difference of more than Rs 10 crore in realisation amount of creditors against their admitted claim."

# **NIKHAT & 3 OTHERS MOVE TO QUARTERFINALS**



"fatigued" Nikhat Zareen continued Aher winning run to enter the quarterfinals along with three other pugilists, including Commonwealth Games bronze medallist Jaismine Lamboria, at the Women's World Championships here on

Competing in her first international tournament in 50kg weight class, Nikhat saw off Mexico's Patricia Alvarez Herrera 5-0 to notch up her third win of the tour-

Commonwealth Games champion Nitu Ghanghas (48kg) won her bout with a first round RSC against Sumaiya Qosimova of Tajikistan, while last year's bronze medallist Manisha Moun (57kg) got the better of Nur Elif Turhan of Turkey when the referee ruled in her favour in the third round. Jaismine (60kg) came from a round down to overpower Mijgona Samadova of Tajikistan.

Bamboriya (66kg), however, bowed out of the tournament.

While Shashi lost 0-4 to Mai Kito of Japan, Manju was literally out-punched by Navbakhor Khamidova of Uzbekistan.

Nikhat took a few seconds to decipher her opponent's game plan before attacking. She used her nimble feet to duck away from Herrera's counter attacks. Both the boxers have moved down

from the 52kg weight division. Well aware of the Mexican's aggressive style of play, Nikhat used her speed to land accurate jabs Herrera, whom she had beaten in the

last edition, tried her best to shift the momentum in her favour but Nikhat's relentless attacks proved too strong. Nikhat, who has already played three

bouts, including one against the top seed, and is still three bouts away from the gold, said she is feeling fatigued.

"I am happy that I have defeated the nadova of Tajikistan. person that has got seeding number one," the unseeded Nikhat, who had several cuts

on her lip, said after her bout.

"I still have some fatigue from my last round as it was against the top seed. It was tough and her punches landed pretty well so my neck was a little tight and my body a little slow compared to my last bout. But I am happy that I won unanimous this time.

"In my boxing career, this is the first competition that I'll play six bouts because I didn't get a seeding, but I am not focussing on that."

Eight Indian pugilists -- Nitu, Nikhat, Sakshi Choudhary (52kg), Manisha, Jaismine, Lovlina Borgohain (75kg), Saweety Boora (81kg) and Nupur Sheoran (+81kg) will compete in the quarterfinals on Wednesday.

Earlier in the opening session of the day, Nitu registered her second RSC win as many bouts in the tournament.

Both Nitu and Qosimova tried to figure out each other's game, but then the Indian connected four straight jabs which forced the referee to give the opponent her

Nitu continued her onslaught as she cornered the Tajikistan pugilist and pummelled her with straight jabs.

The referee gave Qosimova her second standing count before calling the contest in the Indian's favour much to the disappointment of her opponent, who kept showing the thumbs down gesture when the result was called.

The experienced Manisha used a straight jab followed by a combination of punches to assert her authority.

Considerably taller than the Turkish boxer, Manisha used that to her advantage as she unleashed a right and left hook followed by a straight jab. Turhan looked to attack in the second round after receiving two standing counts in the first three minutes but Manisha continued landing hooks and jabs quite seamlessly.

She kept moving around to dodge her opponent's punches. A flurry of jabs and hooks by Manisha led the referee to stop the contest in favour of the home boxer with only few seconds left for the final bell.

## Former India's National champion Satinder quits DoJ job to join Australia boxing team support staff

She was MC Mary Kom's contemporary but the trajectory of Satinder Kaur's life-path was entirely different from the iconic six-time

World Champion.

While 'Magnificent Mary' scaled new heights post giving birth to her twins, marriage took 2004 National champion Kaur to far away in New South Wales in Australia, where boxing was illegal for women even decade and half back.

And when it became legal, Satinder was pregnant with her first born, a son. She tried to pursue the sport once again but had to quit as she had two small children to tend to.

Satinder had completed her BA degree and a diploma in boxing from NIS Patiala before getting married and moving to Australia in 2007.

In 2020, after years of staying away from the boxing ring, Satinder, gave up her cushy job in the New South Wales' Department of Justice (DOJ) to follow her passion once again. She was appointed as the assistant coach for New South Wales, which she is enjoying thor-

She is also the Australian national team's assistant coach. However, it is a voluntary appointment without any monetary perks.

And thanks to her association to Boxing Australia, Satinder is back to India but in Australian colours, albeit as manager of the Australian women's team that is taking part in the World Championship.
"Woh bolte hai na aapke andar aag jalti

rehti hai woh kam ho jaati hai par abhi bhi sulgh rahi hai (the intensity of the fire in my belly to box went down but it was still there), Satinder, who is town for the Women's World Championships as the Australian team's manager, told PTI.

#### RECOLLECTING GOOD OLD DAYS

Having started boxing under renowned oach and Dronacharya awardee, Shiv Singh, Chandigarh's Satinder, who won the 2004 Nationals after winning the silver a year earlier, rose the domestic ranks pretty quickly.

"I started boxing in India around 2001. would train with coach Shiv Singh. I used competed in the lightweight category (63kg).

First the coach refused to train me because he didn't train girls. The first two weeks I would go and just sit and look at every one. He didn't make me do anything.

"But I was determined that I have to do boxing. Seeing my hard work and dedication, sir decided to train me and in three months of training I got a silver in the 2003 nation-

Since no women trained under Singh, Satinder had no option but to spar with men which motivated her to improve her fitness. And the silver medal was followed by a gold in 2004 Nationals a year later.

In the national camp she trained alongside the likes of the legendary MC Mary Kom and World Champions L Sarita Devi and Jenny RL and returning to the Indra Gandhi Indoor Stadium is like a blast from the past filled with nostalgia.

"I feel so coming back here. I met some of the boxers who were with me in the camp after 19 years."

#### PSYCHOLOGICAL BOOST

The 40-year-old Satinder is hopeful that her work with Australian team would be appreciated and she would have a more permanent role in the set-up.

"I am grateful to Boxing Australia and Boxing Federation of India for this opportunity," said Satinder, who hopes her good work would earn her a permanent gig with Boxing

"When I am coaching those 1-2 hours my thoughts are 100 per cent on coaching, I am not thinking about anything else. That gives me a lot of satisfaction. Psychological it works

#### **DOTING MOM**

Despite being away for over half a month, Satinder - the mother and wife has made sure her children and husband are cared "I cook everything before I go some-

where. Right now I am away for 20 days so I have cooked curries for every day and stored it in the fridge before coming.

Chiesa ws a starter on the team that beat England on penalties in the last final in 2021.

Ivan Provedel of Lazio, one of four goalkeepers called up by coach Roberto Mancini, also withdrew and was replaced by Cremonese's Marco Carnesecchi. Italy begin the defence of their title with a rematch of the Euro 2020 final against England in Naples on Thursday, before travelling to Malta on Sunday.

Kylian Mbappe will take over as captain of France after Hugo Lloris stepped down fol-lowing the World Cup final defeat to Argentina, a source close to the team said.

Paris Saint-Germain forward Mbappe, 24, accepted the role after discussions with coach Didier Deschamps.

His first game as captain will be Friday's Euro 2024 qualifier against the Netherlands at the Stade de France, Les Bleus' first match since their World Cup final disappointment in Doha on December 18.

Tottenham goalkeeper Lloris, 36, brought an end to his international career in January, in the weeks after Lionel Messi's Argentina side beat the French in a penalty shootout following

to return to the club, which has always meant so much to me, and to be given the important task of turning the team's fortunes around," Hodgson said in a club statement. "Our sole objective now is to start winning matches, and to get the points necessary to ensure our Premier

League status.' Hodgson will be assisted by Paddy McCarthy, with Ray

If Starc is giving sleepless nights to the batters, the other 'Mitchell — Mitchell Marsh has sent the Indian bowlers on a leather hunt by hitting nearly a dozen sixes (11) across two games. Tackling 'Mitchell The Menace' will be topmost on the

Indian team's agenda.

The series is locked at 1-1 and the starry quartet of Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli, Shubman Gill and Suryakumar Yadav will have to bat out of their skins to stop the left-arm pacer, who is gearing up to once again bring the ball back viciously into the right-handers while taking a

A sea change on the technical aspect, as well mental makeup, will be the need of the hour, and Starc has exposed their frailties pretty badly.

The white ball games in India are mostly played on flat decks, where one can get away by hitting through the line, where one doesn't need too much of feet movement. A batter can plonk the front-foot and hit deliveries across the line with a fair degree of success. But Starc, blessed with bet-

ter skill sets, changed the questionnaire with deliveries that would either straighten in the off-middle line or cut back sharply towards leg-middle after a fair amount of deviation in the

The Indians have known what Starc has done for the longest time but they failed to factor in that conditions in Mumbai and Visakhapatnam would assist his bowling a bit more. In Mumbai, there was coastal city of Visakhapatnam, the ball did more in the air than

 $\mathbf{H}^{\mathrm{e}}$  is more than happy with the takeaways from the nine home ODIs that Indian team has played and has already narrowed his World Cup core team to 17-18 players, head coach Rahul Dravid said on the eve of the series

India are going into the decider having already played eight home games — three versus Sri Lanka, three versus New Zealand and three against Australia finishing on Wed-

nesday.

Did he achieve what he had set out to in nine home ODIs, keeping World Cup in mind? "We have to a large extent. We have got a lot more clarity at the end of these nine games irrespective of what happens tomorrow. We need to keep building on that clarity.

For us it is now the different playing XI combinations and just ensuring that we play different combinations at times just to ensure that we are able to do that in the World Cup and we are not surprised by anything in the World Cup," Dravid told mediapersons here on Tuesday.

The head coach rued the absence of an injured Shreyas Iyer, who had been earmarked to bat at No. 4 in the World Cup. The coach at the same time was sympathetic towards Suryakumar Yadav, who hasn't yet set the ODI stage on fore unlike T20 format.

"Obviously. It is unfortunate for Shreyas to get injured. He is probably one of those guys who would bat at No.4 and given a lot of time at that position. If you notice we have stuck to the people in positions. For two years leading into this run, there is a lot of T20 cricket played and we did not have a lot of one-day cricket and if there are injuries and all that, we do have options.'

But does Surya's first-ball ducks isn't really worrying Dravid.

"Not really concerned about Surya. Hé got two very good balls. One of things about Surva is that he is learning the 50-overs game. The T20 is slightly different. In T20, he has played 10 years of IPL.

"He (Surya) has played a lot of T20 cricket. He has played a lot of high pressure T20 games. Even though he

Consistency in selection has always been key for Dravid and right now, if there is one wrist spinner, who will get a long rope, it will be Kuldeep Yadav and not Yuzvendra

"We are always presuming that the wickets will spin in India. We just actually presume. I don't think the last 2 spun at all. We never know what we are going to get in the World Cup," Dravuid said.


