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Rahul unites 18 Opp parties; chinks in MVA over Savarkar

Uddhav asks Rahul to refrain from 'insulting' Savarkar; Opp leaders in black robes protest in LS

Disqualification of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi from the Lok Sabha last week has brought under one umbrella 18 Opposition parties whose leaders attended a strategy meeting late on Monday evening at Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge's residence. Former Congress president Sonia Gandhi and Rahul too were present in the meeting.

However, Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray) leader Sanjay Raut said the party did not attend the meeting at Kharge's residence in protest against Rahul's "unacceptable" remarks against VD Savarkar.

The Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray) said Rahul's attack on freedom fighter VD Savarkar will lead to ebbing of sympathy he has gained due to his disqualification as a Lok Sabha member.

An editorial in party mouthpiece "Saamana" said

the truth, which Rahul is fighting for today, will not win by making defamatory statements against Savarkar.

At a rally on Sunday, Uddhav Thackeray said he considers Savarkar as his "idol", and asked Rahul to refrain from "insulting" him.

Leaders of TMC, AAP and BRS attended the meeting. The TMC, which has so far stayed away from the Opposition's protests, joined the sit-in at Vijay Chowk in the morning.

TMC supremo and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee will hold a dharna in Kolkata. BRS, earlier known as TRS, too expressed their solidarity with the Opposition

which has so far been making attempts for a third front of its kind eyeing TMC, DMK, Shiv Sena, JD(U) on its side.

To keep up its charge against the Government, the Congress has decided to hold Press conferences across the country on March 28 and 29.

"Senior Congress leaders will address Press conferences in 35 cities on March 28 and 29 on 'Democracy Disqualified'.

Among other issues, the reality of 'Modani' and the Modi Government's clean chit to Nirav Modi and Lalit Modi will also be highlighted," party general secretary Jairam Ramesh said.

Rahul asked to vacate house; Cong insulting judiciary, alleges BJP

The Housing Committee of the Lok Sabha on Monday served a notice on Rahul Gandhi, asking the disqualified Member of Parliament to vacate the Government bungalow allotted to him by April 22, official sources said on Monday.

Rahul, who enjoys Z-plus security, has been living in the 12 Tughlaq Lane bungalow in the heart of Lutyens' Delhi since 2005. The Housing Committee of the Lok Sabha, headed by BJP MP CR Patil, comprises 11 members from different parties.

Meanwhile, the BJP launched a multi-pronged attack on the Congress, Rahul and Priyanka Vadra, accusing them of being "arrogant" and "disrespectful" to the judiciary.

Commerce Minister and senior BJP leader Piyush Goyal asked the Congress MPs whether they came to attend the Parliament session dressed



in black and staged protests to insult the "temple of democracy" and the country's law and order to justify Gandhi's remarks against the Other Backward Classes (OBCs). "Was it a protest against the court that convicted Rahul Gandhi or against the Supreme Court which ruled that anyone sentenced to two years (in jail) becomes disqualified (from Parliament or a state Assembly) automatically?"

Information & Broadcasting Minister Anurag Thakur hit out at Priyanka, saying it was out of "arrogance" that she compared the Gandhi family with the dynasty of Lord Ram.

Block Amritpal's escape, arrest him: India to Nepal

Fugitive radical leader is likely to be hiding in Himalayan nation

As Amritpal Singh continues to escape the police dragnet, India has requested the Nepal Government not to allow the fugitive radical leader, believed to be hiding there, to flee to a third country and arrest him if he escapes using Indian passport or any other fake passport.

In a letter sent to the Department of Consular Services on Saturday, the Indian Embassy in Kathmandu has requested the Government agencies to arrest Singh if he tries to flee from Nepal, the Kathmandu Post newspaper reported on Monday.

"Singh is currently hiding in Nepal," the paper said, citing a copy of the letter obtained by it. "The esteemed Ministry is requested to inform the Department of Immigration not to permit Amritpal Singh flee Nepal for any third country and arrest him if he attempts to escape using Indian Passport or any other fake passport under intimation to this mission," it said.



Khalistan supporters in Canada burn Tricolour

In Ottawa protesters reach embassy, breaching security

Stepping up their protests, alleged Khalistan supporters have burnt the Indian flag outside its consulate in Toronto and came close to the boundary wall of the Indian embassy in Ottawa. More protests are expected in the coming days causing concern about security of the Indian diplomats there. Another

protest was held outside the Indian consulate late Sunday in Vancouver. The protesters late on Saturday staged a demonstration in front of the consulate in Toronto and the Tricolour was burnt with several in the gathering shouting "Khalistan Zindabad" in the presence of local police, reports said.

Two days earlier, on Thursday, protesters from Montreal and the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) gathered outside the High Commission in Ottawa.

Gangster Atiq, brother shifted to Prayagraj jail; 'verdict' today

Gangster-politician Atiq Ahmed was brought to the Naini Central Jail in Prayagraj in Uttar Pradesh on Monday evening amid tight security arrangements.

The police cavalcade bringing him from a prison in Gujarat reached the Naini Jail at 5.30 pm. Hours after Atiq was escorted to the prison from Gujarat, his brother Khalid Azim, alias Ashraf, was also brought to the Naini Central Jail in Prayagraj amid tight security arrangements.

Ashraf and Atiq will be produced before a court on Tuesday, when it is likely to pass an order in a 17-year-old kidnapping case against them. The former MP is an accused in the case.

Ashraf, lodged in the Bareilly District Jail since July 2020, was brought to the Naini Central Jail Monday evening amid tight security arrangements, officials said.

Put off harvesting, shield crops from unwanted rain, IMD advises N-E farmers

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Monday advised farmers in Assam, Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh to postpone harvesting of matured crops, and keep already-harvested produce in safe places or cover them in the field with tarpaulin sheets to protect it from likely fresh spell of rainfall and thunderstorm over North-East from March 29.

For farmers in Jammu, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and Haryana and a few other States from northern India, the IMD suggested resumption of harvesting of matured crops during clear weather.

"A fresh spell of rainfall and thunderstorm beginning from March 29 will impact Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, West Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha and Chhattisgarh," the IMD said.

"Strong wind/hail may



damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops," the IMD said in its advisory to farmers.

In its bulletin, the IMD advised to postpone sowing of maize in Arunachal Pradesh and drain out excess water from crop fields.

"Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking to vegetables," it added.

According to the Union Ministry of Agriculture, India's wheat production in 2023 is expected to be a record 112 million tonnes as good weather pushed the acreage under the staple to 34.1 million hectares, 12 per cent higher than the 5-year average of 30.4 million.

SC OK's UP civic body polls with OBC reservation

The Supreme Court on Monday paved the way for holding the urban local body polls in Uttar Pradesh as it allowed the State Election Commission to issue a notification in this regard in two days with an OBC quota in terms of a report of the UP Backward Classes Commission.

"This court, in an order dated January 4, 2023, noted that in view of the decisions of this court, the Government of Uttar Pradesh issued a notification for setting up the Uttar Pradesh Backward Classes Commission in December 2022. Though the tenure of the commission was six months, it was to complete its task by March 31, 2023," said the SC.

It further said, "The solicitor general informs that the report has been submitted on March 9, 2023 to the cabinet. The process of notifying the local body elections is going on and will be done in two days. The plea is disposed of. The direction in this order is not to be used as precedent."

Cheetah dies 6 months after translocation from Namibia

One of the eight cheetahs translocated from Namibia in mid-September last year died of kidney failure at Kuno National Park in Madhya Pradesh on Monday. The death of the more than four-and-a-half-year old female feline Sasha is being seen as a setback to Project Cheetah, aimed at reviving the population of the world's fastest land animal in India, seven decades after they became extinct.

Sasha was suffering from a kidney ailment even before her translocation from Namibia, said Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (PCCF-Wildlife) JS Chauhan.

"A monitoring team found Sasha lazy on March 22, following which they decided to take her to a quarantine enclosure for treatment," he said. Her blood sample was col-



lected the same day and examined. A wildlife expert armed with a portable ultrasound machine went inside the KNP to examine the ailing cheetah and it was found that Sasha's kidneys were infected, said Chauhan.

Later, senior Wildlife Institute of India (WII) scientists and KNP management contacted the Cheetah Conservation Fund, Namibia, to know the treatment history of Sasha.

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QUALITY EDUCATION MUST BE IMPARTED IN UNIVERSITIES: GOV

'GOVT UNABLE TO DELEGATE POWER TO THE UNIVERSITIES'

Governor cum Chancellor of the universities of the State CP Radhakrishnan today said, "We are not in this position to change the system. We have to work under this system. This is the reason that the government is unable to delegate powers to the universities of the State."

The Chancellor of the universities inaugurated the first vice chancellors' conference of the Jharkhand organised by the department of higher and technical education department and Vinoba Bhave University, Hazaribag in the Vivekanand seminar hall of the university on Monday.

In the inaugural speech the Chancellor said, "I have listened to the problems of the different universities of the

state and assured that all the problems will be presented on the proper platform."

Emphasizing on the quality of education, the Governor

said that the university is always known by the quality education not by the buildings and infrastructure. He said that the vice chancellors of

the universities must listen to the genuine problems of the students and try to solve them on their level.

On the issue of increasing the court cases in the university, the Governor said that there are more than 50 per cent cases of such nature which can be solved on the university level. The vice chancellors have to work in this direction.

He further said that the success story of the universities is not vice chancellor, secretary and other officials, it depends upon the dedication of the teachers towards the study. The vice chancellor should work on the admission of the students. It should be on time, if the admission will be in time then examination and result will be in time.

"There are some problems regarding recruitment of

teaching and non-teaching staff in the state universities. Steps will be taken soon to fill up the vacant posts of teachers as well as non-teaching staff in various universities and colleges of the state. The Vice-Chancellors of universities should prepare the details of vacancies, sanctioned posts in the universities or Constituent Colleges for teaching and non-teaching staff along with roster clearance to speed up the process of recruitment," he said. The Governor said that all-out effort should be made to encourage the students from backward communities, particularly girls students from scheduled tribe communities, who are interested in pursuing higher education. All the Universities need to analyse the breakup of students in U.G and P.G Courses. He further



said that the Academic Calendar helps students get the full visibility of events that would happen during the year. The academic calendar enables educational institutions to connect and communicate with all students and parents enrolled in the institution's various courses and the batches. It is crucial for

students and teachers to plan their studies. The advance release of the academic calendar also makes sure the activities and events happen exactly as per the plan and these do not need additional communication. "Better job opportunities for students should be the goal of education. For the proper placement of students, all universities must organize placement fairs and call local industries to explore the possibilities of job requirements for students. As per New Education Policy, all V.Cs should concentrate on rationalisation of the subjects being studied in universities and introduce new subjects as per the market demand," he said.

"For the improvement in education, Universities should explore the possibilities for students exchange pro-

grammes with other universities in other states. Branding of the university should be such that students should feel proud to be part of that university," said the Governor.

He assured that we are going to set up a university service commission in the state. He said that in future all the appointments and assistant professor will be on merit of the candidates.

Vijay Kumar Srivastava and Sudhanshu Ranjan and all the vice chancellors of the state expressed their views. The vote of thanks was given by director higher education Garima Singh.

The vice chancellor of the VBU Mukul Naryan Deo honoured the chancellor by presenting a memento and Secretary Rahul Kumar Purwar was honoured by the registrar of the university.

He was as little as my red remote control car which I was interestingly very fond of. Hash-brown skinned with hair grown maturely in some places. He was covered in dust and had dust brown eyes. Tiny legs, short tail and enormous energy are something that would fit him correctly. He was simply "adorable". We left him in the garden area and saw him run enthusiastically everywhere.

He would collide with the table placed at the front and when tired, he would stop, sit and squeak. Nothing more could be expected from a 32 day old pup who could not even analyse if he struck the table, he would get hurt and irrespective he would still dash into the table again. His actions and his expressions never failed to bring a huge grin on my face. It was mid Covid when he had brought him. Post Covid, it was time to go back to my school again. I studied in a boarding school and the idea of me having to live alone and not in the company of my doggo did not strike me until the day when I had to depart to the airport to catch my flight. When at school, I would miss him dearly. His funny roll on the grass and the excitement with which he would come when he saw his meal in my hand is something that the words would fail to describe. SINO RUSSIAN JOINT STATEMENT

The Chinese President Xi Jinping recently visited Russia and the two leaders Xi Jinping and Putin had several rounds of one to one meeting and a joint statement was issued. Naturally, it covered the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict and Xi Jinping made a prescription for an early end of the conflict. The second issue that was referred to in the joint statement was Quad which consists of America, Australia, UK and India which aims to maintain

a balance of power in the Indo-Pacific region. The statement criticised Quad as a close and exclusive alliance.

China claims control over South China Sea which is a vast expanse of ninety six lakh square kilometres of the Pacific Ocean where China has artificially made more than two hundred islands and has deployed powerful weapons there. The whole region is rich in mines, minerals natural gas etc. and the maritime trade done through it is of critical importance.

The rest of the world contests this Chinese claim and Quad aims to contain the expansion of Chinese influence in the region. The Chinese prescription for peace in Ukraine is not likely to cut much ice as the America led west won't allow China to walk away with the laurels of a successful arbitrator of peace and further enhance its stature globally.

The reference to Quad is disturbing for India because it is for the first time that Russia has joined China in criticising Quad in writing. Russia is an old, time-tested and the most valuable ally of India. Its growing inclination, rather dependence on China as a junior partner is definitely a bad omen for India. This dependence might prove to be temporary and Russia could regain its pre Ukraine conflict stature after the Ukraine conflict is over.

The growing proximity of China and Russia would lead to the formation of a powerful military alliance that would challenge the West. India would be left to fend for itself as it has serious boundary disputes with China. The Russia China proximity is, therefore, a cause of concern for India. It is also a cause of grave concern for the West as it is only Russia which has nuclear parity with America led

NATO.

Who is responsible for this mess? Definitely America, whose sanctions have left no option to Russia but to turn to China for all kinds of help. China has so far refrained from giving any meaningful and effective weapon systems to Russia which has kept the Ukraine conflict confined to the present level. The day China decides to supply Russia advanced weapon systems and logistic support, the whole texture of the conflict would change and it would further erode the sheen of American hegemony. The West would be forced to either upscale the conflict or meekly surrender to the marching strides of Chinese hegemony. Such a situation would be a cliffhanger for India and a balance of strategic interests would be very hard to achieve.

However, it won't be easy for China to take such a course of action as its eco-

economic interests are closely intertwined with the West. There could be no sudden disconnect. Further, this joint statement might alert America to recalibrate its policy vis-a-vis the Ukraine conflict. It is difficult to say how things would unfold but it would be a testing time for the Indian diplomacy. India cannot trust America and the West as a faithful ally going by their past records. At present, the increasing incidents of Khalistani vandalism in America, UK and Canada are symptomatic of a malady which is more deep and profound than meets the eye.

The fast changing situation demands a fresh look to our defence preparedness. India has bought a large number of arms, ammunition and weapon systems from Russia. Their repair, maintenance and spare parts need Russian support. The capacity of Russia to do so has been greatly depleted due to its

ongoing conflict with Ukraine. It is good that India has embarked upon the policy of self-reliance in matters of defence requirements and diversified its sources of procurement. Of late, India has bought many weapon systems from America, UK and France. This has reduced our dependence on Russia. But India should be watchful as America and her allies are known for strangulating their buyers in the name of sanctions when they have a clash of interests. The saving grace for India is its importance as a member of BRICS which finds mention in the joint statement.

Russia, too, would try its best to keep India strong to balance the increasing influence of China in the region.

'MGNREGA schemes should be visible on ground'

Rural Development Department Secretary, Prashant Kumar, on Monday, instructed all the Deputy Development Commissioners (DDCs) that whatever schemes are going on from MGNREGA should also be visible on the ground.

Kumar said that MGNREGA is not just a scheme, but it is a powerful means of providing employment to the villagers. He has expressed his displeasure over the delay in many works. Today, the Secretary was speaking in the review meeting organized through video conferencing with all the DDCs of the State in the auditorium of the Rural Development Department. He has asked the workers to get the problems caused by the rejected transactions rectified



within a week. All DDCs have been told that officers should note that complaints should not be received.

Under the Amrit Sarovar scheme, after reviewing the renovation of 75 ponds, directed to complete the work on time. He also reviewed the Rurban Mission and Jal Chhajan.

Kumar said that one lakh wells would be constructed by the State Government. Its target will be decided district-wise. For this, assistance

amount will also be given to the beneficiaries for well construction. Rs 50, 000 per well assistance amount will be given to the beneficiaries. "One lakh wells will be constructed in two phases. 50, 000 in the first phase this financial year and 50, 000 in the second phase in the next financial year. He informed that the work of plantation of saplings is being done on a large scale in the state under the Birsra Green Village Scheme. In such a situation,

the construction of these wells will be easy. The launch of this scheme will help in providing 100 days work guarantee in MGNREGA. The laborers will be provided work as per the demand in the financial year.

During the meeting, MGNREGA Commissioner Rajeshwari B also directed necessary progress in creation of man-days under MGNREGA. The MGNREGA commissioner directed all the concerned DDCs to prepare a proper work draft in a planned manner and work towards completing all the schemes at the earliest. Instructed to get 100 percent Aadhaar seeding of active laborers under MGNREGA scheme after observing the earlier pending schemes, he directed to complete them on priority basis. At the same

time, he also directed to upload the evidence of pending ATR on priority basis. Plans for 2019-20 were reviewed and after taking information about the pending plans, all the DDCs were instructed to prepare an action plan and complete it without delay. During this, answers have been sought from the officials of the districts living in the worst condition in the state.

The MGNREGA Commissioner directed to expedite the completion of Veer Shaheed Poto Ho Sports Development Scheme. He expressed his displeasure over the non-completion of construction of sports grounds in Giridih, Koderma, Pakur and Simdega districts and directed the DDC to complete the construction work soon.

Ex-MLA Mamta Devi gets bail in Hazaribagh case

A hearing was held in the Jharkhand High Court on the criminal appeal challenging the conviction of former Ramgarh MLA Mamta Devi in two separate cases of shell firing. During the hearing, the court granted bail to Mamta Devi in the Hazaribagh case while the date of March 31 has been fixed for the hearing in the Ramgarh case.

The hearing was held in the court of High Court Judge Justice Navneet Kumar on Mamta Devi's petition. Advocate Bhola Nath Ojha presented the case on behalf of the state government.

Former MLA Mamta Devi has been sentenced by Ramgarh Civil Court and Hazaribagh Civil Court in two different cases. In one case, on 13 December 2022, he was sentenced to 5 years. In the second case, on January 4, 2023, the special court of Hazaribagh sentenced Mamta Devi and BJP leader Rajeev Jaiswal to 2-2 years in the fourth case of Gola firing. Challenging both these sentences, an appeal has been filed in the High Court on behalf of Mamta Devi.

An appeal has been filed in the hope of reducing the sentence. Today's hearing was held in the court of High Court Judge Justice Navneet Kumar. Advocate Bhola Nath Ojha presented the state government's side. Until the verdict in the Ramgarh case comes, Mamta Devi will remain in jail. On December 13, 2022, 13 accused including Mamta Devi were sentenced to five years each in Rajrappa police station case number 79/2016. In the second case, on January 4, 2023, the special court of Hazaribagh sentenced Mamta Devi and BJP leader Rajeev Jaiswal to 2-2 years in the fourth case of Gola firing.

Cabinet nod to purchase of 224 buses for Capital City

Rs 57.82 crore approved for the development of phase 2 of Transport Nagar

In an effort to streamline the transport system in the Capital, the State Cabinet today gave its nod for purchase of buses for Ranchi. As per a decision taken today in a Cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Hemant Soren, the Urban development department will spend Rs 605.45 crore for purchase of 224 buses for Ranchi Municipal area. Out of these 224 buses, 220 buses will be non-Ac buses while the rest 14 buses will be AC electric buses. Sources said that Ranchi Municipal Corporation will be the first civic body in the State to run electric buses in the State. The state government has decided to bring down the dependence on non-renewable energy sources and the decision to run electric buses in the Capital is a step in this direction. A systemic transformation in the public transportation system and introduction of fully EV-powered buses that can help people save considerable money while being gentle on the environment in need of

the hour. The cabinet today approved 44 proposals, including Rs 57.82 crore for the development of phase 2 of Jharkhand's capital's transport city.

In the next two years, Jharkhand's first transport nagar will be built on 40 acres of land on Ranchi's outskirts to reduce traffic congestion and improve the city's supply chain for commodities.

Work on transport nagar (a parking lot for heavy vehicles and goods carriers) at Jharkhand capital Ranchi started last year. The transport nagar is coming up at an area of 40.68 acres of land in front of the ITBP campus in Sukurhuttu in Kanke block with an estimated project completion time of two years at a cost of Rs 113.24 crore.

In today's cabinet meeting other decisions that were taken included extension of the period for which non-government educational institutions could operate an ashram school and a residential school under the welfare department, as well as the extension of the period for which non-educational insti-

tutions could operate Eklavya Model Residential School.

Other approvals included the state bearing the burden of the seventh pay revision benefit for employees of urban local bodies, running NBC activities through the school education department rather than the sports department, including common telecom infrastructure in the Jharkhand Building Bylaws 2006, forming the Jharkhand Labour Promoter Recruitment Rules (Amendment) 2023, and forming the Jharkhand Industrial Training Service Cadre Revised Rules 2023.

Other significant approvals include spending 84 crores in all Simdega, Khunti, and Dumka block headquarters to provide internet service, the formation of Jharkhand Product Constable Service (Revised) Rules 2023 and the formation of State Service Supply Rules 2023, the purchase of 244 city buses for the Ranchi Municipal Corporation area, and the installation of automated rain gauges in 1633 panchayats and 216 blocks.

Mock Drill at all hospitals of State on April 1

UNION HEALTH MINISTRY TAKES STOCK OF PREPARATIONS IN STATE

In view of the possible spread of Covid 19 in certain states, instructions were given by the Union Health Ministry to all the states through a Video Conference meeting on Monday. Emphasis has been laid on making a strategy for vaccination and testing to prevent the spread of Covid-19. Instructions have also been received to speed up vaccination and other preparations before the upcoming Haj pilgrimage.

Mock drill is to be done by health institutions across the country simultaneously on 10th and 11th April. In this regard, instructions have been given by Dr. Bhuvanesh Pratap Singh, Mission Director, National Health Mission, to conduct mock drills in all the hospitals of Jharkhand state on April 1 before the national level mock drill.

He said that it was necessary to do this in all the hos-

pitals of the State in view of the increasing spread of Covid 19. He said that monitoring of Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI) and Influenza Like Illness (ILI) in the state should be done by all the health institutions and also directed to get the potential patient tested with Rapid Antigen Kit.

He also directed to repair all RTPCR labs and ensure availability of kits. He has directed the health officials to make all necessary preparations and be on alert mode. He instructed a nodal doctor from the state level for vaccination and other necessary health support for Haj pilgrims. Jharkhand Additional Chief Health Secretary Arun Kumar Singh, Campaign Director Bhuvanesh Pratap Singh, State Immunization Officer Dr Rakesh Dayal, WHO Team Lead Jharkhand Dr Amarendra Kumar were present in the meeting through video conferencing.

ED questions Rajiv Arun Ekka in money laundering case

EKKA APPEARS BEFORE ED AFTER SKIPPING FIRST SUMMONS

Former principal secretary to the Chief Minister, Rajeev Arun Ekka, appeared before the Enforcement Directorate on Monday in connection with a probe into a money laundering case.

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) questioned Rajiv Arun Ekka for hours. Ekka reached the central probe agency office at Hinoo at 11 am today and the ED interrogated him for hours. This is the second summons that ED appeared before the agency, earlier he had skipped the ED interrogation on plea that he was busy due to the budget session of the Assembly.

Ekka came on ED radar after BJP leader and former Chief Minister Babul Marandi released a video clip in which Ekka was seen disposing of government files from the office of Vishal Choudhary, a suspect in a money laundering case. The suspect, Vishal Choudhary, had faced an ED raid in May last year. Sources said that during the raid on Choudhary, the ED gathered electronic evidence and on that basis, a summons was sent to Rajiv Ekka.

The former principal secretary to the CM, was removed from the Chief

Minister's Office after charges were brought against him by the opposition leader.

Ekka appeared before sleuths of the Enforcement Directorate here in connection with a probe into the alleged irregularities in the MGNREGA scheme and money laundering linked to cases against Pooja Singhal, "an official of the

central agency said.

The agency is also probing Singhal's role in the alleged irregularities in the mining sector of the state as part of a case filed under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) along with the MGNREGA 'scam', the ED official said.

The state government had earlier set up a one-member inquiry commission headed by Jharkhand High Court's former chief justice Vinod Kumar Gupta to probe into the allegations against Ekka.

In view of the "signing of official documents at a private place", BJP leader and former chief minister Babul Marandi had written a letter to Chief Secretary Sukhdev Singh earlier this month, seeking a thorough investigation into the alleged involvement of a power broker in the case, besides an engineer in the Police Building Construction Corporation. Marandi also sought action against Ekka and departmental engineers.

Ekka is the third IAS officer to be interrogated by the ED in the illegal mining case. Prior to this, Puja Singhal's location was raided, and her case is pending before the special court. Saheb Ganj DC Ram Nivesh Dwivedi was also summoned by the ED.

CRS inspects Koderma-Jharhi rail section

Commissioner of Safety (Railways), Eastern Circle Suvomoy Mitra today inspected the newly constructed Koderma-Jharhi



section (17 km) under the Koderma-Tilaiya New Rail Line Project (65 km). After inspection, speed trial was successfully done by special train. It may be noted that under the 65 km long Koderma-Tilaiya new rail line project, the construction work from 24 km long Tilaiya to Kharondh has already been completed and after the completion of the 17 km long Koderma to Jharhi construction work, CRS inspection was done. The construction work on the remaining Jharhi to Kharondh is going on at a fast pace.

2 female drug peddlers held

Ranchi Police arrested two women smugglers from Bajra Rof Pandra OP area on Monday, March 27. From whom 70 bags of brown sugar was recovered. The market price of the drugs is around Rs 5 lakhs. At the same time, the police are interrogating both the women. Police are trying to find out who all are involved in this business. Police had received secret information, in which it was told that two women do drug business from a rented house in Bajra of Pandra OP area. On the basis of information, the police raided the place, from where two women were arrested with 70 pudias of brown sugar. It was told that the arrested women lived in a rented house at Bajra in Padandra OP area. Both are mother-daughter in the relationship. Both do drug business from there.

BJP-Cong stand-off touches new low in LS

The stand-off between the ruling party and the Opposition members on Rahul Gandhi's disqualification and the Adani issue touched a new low in Lok Sabha on Monday with the Congress members trooping into the Well of the house wearing black clothes with two of its MPs throwing papers towards the Chair, leading to adjournment of proceedings in less than a minute till 4 pm.

Lok Sabha was adjourned for the day by the BJP MP Rama Devi who was in the chair after the house resumed its proceedings and passed the finance bill amid the repeat bedlam.

The trouble started right from the word go in the lower house as Congress members wearing black scarves trooped into the Well shouting slogans.

Two Congress members, T N Pratapan and Hibi Eden, who were in the Well holding placards, hurled order papers towards the Chair along with their scarves.

"Dear ED daro mat, Adani per raid karo (ED don't be scared, raid Adani)," read one



of the placards.

Congress leader Sonia Gandhi was seen wearing a black scarf while other members of her party wore black shirts. National Conference leader Farooq Abdullah was wearing a black kurta.

Amid the ruckus by Opposition members, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla adjourned proceedings of the House in less than a minute after it assembled for the Question Hour.

"I want to run the House with dignity," Speaker Birla said, adding that "proceedings are adjourned till 4 pm."

Lok Sabha has been derailed since the second leg of the Budget Session commenced on March 13 with Opposition members demanding a joint parliamentary com-

mittee probe into the alleged Adani share manipulation issue.

The Lok Sabha could hardly conduct any business in the second part of the budget session with a number of bills waiting to be passed.

However, Parliament on Monday approved the Union Budget for 2023-24 with the Lok Sabha clearing the Finance Bill as amended by the Rajya Sabha, amid continuous uproar by the Opposition over the Adani issue. The amendment to the Finance Bill 2023, which sought to correct an error with regard to the tax rate on Securities Transaction Tax, was moved by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman.

The passage of the Finance Bill completes the budgetary exercise for 2023-24.

Khalistan supporters take out car rally in New York

Continuing their protests in the US, alleged Khalistan supporters have taken out a car rally in New York. However, there was no violence reported. The rally in support of Amritpal Singh took place late Sunday a day after the Khalistan backers staged a demonstration outside the Indian embassy in Washington.

A large number of Khalistan supporters staged a protest at the iconic Times Square in New York to express support for the fugitive radical preacher Amritpal Singh.

The protesters took out a car rally that originated from the Baba Makhana Shah Lubana Sikh Center in the Richmond Hill neighbourhood and culminated at Times Square in the heart of Manhattan city on Sunday afternoon amid tight security.

With blaring music and loud horns, a multitude of cars with Khalistani flags and LED mobile billboard trucks displaying photos of Singh crisscrossed the streets near the venue.

Men, women and children gathered in large numbers at the popular New York desti-



nation, carrying the Khalistan flags and raising slogans at the rally.

The protesters, carrying placards reading 'Free Amritpal Singh', held up photos of Singh as they raised anti-India slogans. Singh's photo was also displayed on one of the billboards at Times Square.

There was a heavy police presence in the area with several New York City Police Department (NYPD) vans and cars manning the area.

The car rally came a day after Khalistan supporters gathered outside the Indian Embassy in Washington on Saturday, where many of their speakers tried to incite violence, but timely intervention by an alert US Secret Service and local police prevented a

repeat of London and San Francisco incidents of vandalism at the Indian missions.

India on Friday last week said it expects to see action against the perpetrators of vandalism at its missions abroad and hoped the host governments would prosecute those involved in these incidents instead of holding out assurances.

Addressing the weekly briefing, External Affairs Ministry spokesman Arindam Bagchi said New Delhi also expects the host governments to take measures to prevent the recurrence of such incidents.

"I think we are not just interested in assurances, I think we would like to see action," the External Affairs Ministry spokesman said.

Cong experts deciphering Guj court order; Rahul's appeal to take more time

Four days have elapsed since Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's conviction by a trial court followed by disqualification from Lok Sabha but the appeal at a higher judiciary system which he is not entitled to take some more time as legal experts of the grand old party are still deciphering the translation of the Gujarat court order despite its top leaders like Shakti Sinh Gohil, Ameer Yajnik, are big lawyers in the State and represents party as Rajya Sabha members.

While Congress workers have taken to streets and sported black attires calling Rahul Gandhi's disqualification as MP a 'death of democracy', party is yet to move higher court to appeal against the conviction because the court order is in Gujarati and the translation is taking time.

"There is a procedural delay that's all we can say this time," said a party office bearer.

Party's top legal eagle Abhishek Manu Singhvi, Salman Khurshid, P Chidambaram, Vivek Tankha



are coordinating while also in consultation with its former colleague and currently Rajya Sabha MP backed by Samajwadi Party, Kapil Sibal as the latter has been espousing the cause of Congress, particularly for Rahul Gandhi, through his social media platforms. Sibal had also expressed his dismay over the way Delhi police questioned Rahul over his certain political remarks during Bharat Jodo Yatra.

Congress is also waiting for the outcome of the NCP leader Mohammed Faizal's plea against the Lok Sabha Secretariat for not withdrawing a notification disqualifying him as an MP stayed by the Kerala High Court, now listed for Supreme Court for Tuesday.

CPR urges Govt re-look at Heat Action Plans

The Centre for Policy Research (CPR), a public policy think tank, on Monday picked holes in the Heat Action Plans (HAPs) in 18 states stating that most of them are not only underfunded but also do not target the 'actual' risks faced by local populations. It has recommended the Government to re-look these plans and work on their improvements in keeping with requirements at the ground level.

This is the first critical assessment of the HAPs formulated by the Government over the last ten years as a primary policy response to economically damaging and life threatening heatwaves. They prescribe a variety of preparatory activities, disaster responses, and post-heatwave response measures across state, district, and city government departments to decrease the impact of heatwaves.

The CPR's report "How is India adapting to heatwaves?" a review of 37 heat action plans in the city (nine), district (13) and state (15) levels across 18 states showed that most of them do not explicitly carry out vulnerability assessments, leaving the authorities with little data on where to direct their scarce resources.

Though the exact number of HAPs in India is unknown, some estimates claim the existence of well over 100 HAPs nationwide.

"India has made considerable progress by creating several dozen heat action plans in the last decade. But our assessment reveals several gaps that must be filled in future plans.





NCERT textbooks for 2024-25 session revised in accordance with NEP: Govt

Education Ministry on Monday said the new NCERT textbooks to be introduced in secondary schools from the 2024-25 academic session has been revised in accordance with the new National Education Policy (NEP) and textbooks is to be developed in accordance with the National Curriculum Framework (NCF). "The new textbooks are likely to be introduced from 2024-25 academic session. It is a tall task but we are aiming for that. The textbooks will be revised as per the new NCF, work on which is already going on. Developing textbooks is a laborious task," said a senior official of the Ministry of Education.

All the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) textbooks developed as per the revised NCF will also be available in digital format. "Since COVID-19 has taught us that there is an

appetite for digital learning, all the new textbooks will simultaneously be made available digitally so anybody can download them," he added.

Noting that textbooks should not be "static", the official said an institutional framework will be developed to ensure that the textbooks are updated on a regular basis.


The NEP 2020 envisages a "5+3+3+4" curriculum pedagogical structure. According to the new school education system outlined in NEP 2020, children will spend five years in the foundational stage, three years each in the preparatory and middle stages, and four years in the secondary stage.

The Centre had in 2020 started the process to revise school textbooks by appointing former Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) Chairman K Kasturirangan as the head of a 12-member steering committee responsible for developing a new National Curriculum Framework (NCF).

The four NCFs being pre-gated are -- NCF for Early Childhood Care and Education (NCFECE), NCF for School Education (NCFSE), NCF for Teacher Education (NCFTE), NCF for Adult Education (NCFAE).

SC issues notice to Gujarat Govt in Bilkis case

Observing that Bilkis Bano's gangrape and murder of her family members during the 2002 Godhra riots as a "horrendous" act, the Supreme Court on Monday asked the Gujarat Government whether uniform standards, as followed in other cases of murder, were applied while granting remission to 11 convicts in the Bilkis case. The top court, which at the same time clarified that it would not be overwhelmed by emotions in the case and would only go by the law, also directed the Gujarat Government to present all the relevant documents on April 18, the next date of hearing.

Bano had moved the apex court on November 30 last year

convicts on the plea filed by Bano and asked the parties to complete the pleadings by the next date of hearing. "It is a very horrendous act. We have an experience of people coming to this court saying they have been languishing in jails for ordinary cases of murder and their remission is not being considered. 

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Bank's decision to classify account as fraudulent must be reasoned order: SC

The Supreme Court on Monday held that a decision by a bank classifying a borrower's account as fraudulent must be a reasoned order and such an order should be passed only after giving an opportunity to the borrower. A bench of Chief Justice of India (CJI) DY Chandrachud and Justice Hima Kohli upheld an order of the Telangana High Court in this regard.

The Supreme Court will hear on Tuesday Lakshadweep MP Mohammed Faizal's plea against the Lok Sabha Secretariat for not withdrawing a notification disqualifying him as an MP upon his conviction and 10-year sentence that was later stayed by the Kerala High Court. A bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and justices S Narasimha and JB Pardiwala took note of the submissions of senior advocate AM Singhvi, appearing for the former Lakshadweep parliamentarian, that the person has not been reinstated as an MP despite his conviction and sentence being stayed by the high court.


Singhvi said the appeal of the Union Territory against the High Court order is coming up for hearing before another apex court

bench on Tuesday. "Tag this with the SLP (of Lakshadweep)," said the bench. The Lok Sabha was "prompt to disqualify Faizal as an MP immediately after he was convicted and sentenced by a local court in January this year, but his membership has not been restored yet despite the high court staying the conviction", Singhvi, appearing for the Nationalist Congress Party leader, said.

Faizal stood disqualified from the membership of Lok Sabha from January 11, the date of his conviction in an attempt to murder case by a sessions court in Kavaratti, according to a notification issued on January 13 by the Lok Sabha Secretariat. In his petition filed in the apex court through advocate K R Sasiprabhu, Faizal said the Lok Sabha Secretariat failed to withdraw the notification despite the fact that his conviction was stayed by the high court on January 25.

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CBI chargesheets bank officer for embezzling ₹55 cr from public sector bank accounts

The CBI has charge-sheeted a bank officer and his accomplice whose vulgar greed for online gaming lured them to allegedly embezzle over Rs 55 crore from various accounts of a public sector bank here.

The agency alleged that accused officer Bedanshu Shekhar Mishra and his accomplice Shailesh Kumar Jaiswal committed forgery in Punjab & Sind Bank, where Mishra was employed, to channel funds from various bank accounts into different betting games online, officials said.

Mishra was posted at the North Campus branch of Punjab & Sind Bank at Khalsa College of Delhi University



from June 28, 2021.

In his statement during a bank enquiry, Mishra admitted that he used banking IDs (iden-

tities) of colleagues to make illegal transfers for online gaming bids, they said.

His statement was recorded during the enquiry after the bank noticed irregularities, forgery, siphoning and misappropriation of funds in various

accounts such as RTGS, Inward Deposits Customers, primarily of Khalsa College.

The CBI probe revealed that Mishra was found to have "illegally and without any authority" encashed 32 fixed deposits receipts belonging to Khalsa College, maintained at the bank, amounting to Rs 48.76 crore, while also siphoning Rs 6.74 crore from various Mudra Loan accounts, they said. "During the investigation aforesaid original FDRs are said to have been seized from the Principal of Khalsa College, Jaswinder Singh, out of which 12 FDRs were found to be issued in the name of the Principal, SGTB Khalsa College and rest in the name of student

fund, SGTB Khalsa College," the CBI has alleged.

Mishra used the official IDs allotted to the officer of Khalsa College Branch for transferring the funds into 29 different bank accounts without any supporting vouchers, according to the CBI findings.

"It is further alleged that...Mishra along with an unknown person has carried out these unauthorised forgery and fraudulent transactions by using system ID's of other staff members without their authorities," the chargesheet revealed.

Mishra has a penchant for online games such as Monopoly and CrazyTimes offered on the web site "Goa247.Live," registered in Curacao in the Caribbean and

managed in India by individuals based in Dubai, the probe has revealed.

Between May 12 and September 14 in 2022, Mishra regularly played online games and transferred the liquidated amount of the FDRs, to the tune of Rs 10.81 crore, in the four accounts provided by the gaming website, the agency alleged in the charge-sheet.

Dubai-based individuals Rajat Muralidhar, Nishanth, Rahul Kumar, A Rajath, and Nishanth were managing the gaming website in India.

Rahul Kumar and A Rajath, allegedly lured individuals current account holders to offer their bank accounts in lieu of commission. These personal bank accounts were used

to accept deposits from the customers of the gaming website.

Mishra allegedly sanctioned and opened 48 Mudra loan accounts during the period from June 2021 to November 2022. Jaiswal managed eight of these accounts through his relatives and employees.

The proceeds of the loan amount were allegedly funnelled into the gaming business site GameKing11, and the rest of the amount was allegedly utilised for illegal purposes other than those for which the loans were sanctioned.

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Pro-Khalistan body makes threat calls ahead of G-20

A banned pro-Khalistan organisation has made threat calls to hundreds of people including journalists ahead of a crucial three-day G-20 meeting to be held in Uttarakhand's Ramnagar with an aim to "internationalise" the issue, officials said.

They said those who received the calls on Sunday night heard pre-recorded messages by Gurbhawan Singh Pannu, head of the organization 'Sikh for Justice', in which he said they will raise flags at airports, railway stations and other areas during the meeting days.

"Ramnagar is not a part of India and it will be made a part of Khalistan after Punjab is freed," Pannu said in the message, according to Uttarakhand Special Task Force's Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Senthil Abudai Krishnaraj S. The Chief Scientific Advisors' Roundtable (CSAR) of G-20



countries will be held in Uttarakhand's Ramnagar from March 28-30 with its focus on harnessing the benefits of traditional knowledge in healthcare.

Krishnaraj S said all the numbers from which such recorded calls were received are being traced. The DIG said the Special Task Force is probing the matter. It seems that Pannu is trying to gain "publicity" on the Khalistan issue through the G-20 meeting. However, the Uttarakhand police is fully prepared and

tightened security especially in areas bordering Uttar Pradesh districts of Rampur, Pilibhit and Bareilly, and Nepal.

All government and private vehicles are being checked and religious places are also being monitored, officials said. City Superintendent of Police Manoj Kumar Katyal said religious places near the international border are also being searched, and a special vigil is being kept on the people passing through the India-Nepal border. The police have also pasted posters of Amritpal and his associates at various places, and running a "verification campaign", he said.

The Punjab Police has alerted their Uttarakhand counterpart suspecting that absconding Amritpal Singh might have taken a shelter in Uttarakhand and might flee to Nepal. The Sashastha Seema Bal (SSB) and the state police in Pithoragarh are also keeping a close watch in areas near the India-Nepal border, officials said.

Pvt doctors protesting against Rajasthan Right to Health Bill

Private doctors protesting against the Rajasthan Right to Health Bill took out a massive rally in Jaipur on Monday in a show of strength and to press their demand for its withdrawal. Thousands of doctors, their family members, and people associated with the medical profession including medical shop owners took part in the rally which started from the resident doctors hostel ground of the SMS Hospital.

The rally passed through Suchna Kendra Tiraha, Maharani College Tiraha, Ashok Marg and Panach Batti on MI Road. Private hospitals and nursing homes have been closed for several days due to a strike of private doctors, leading to a rush of patients in government hospitals.

Medical services in government hospitals were also affected as doctors across the state boycotted work for two hours in solidarity with the protesting private doctors. Chief Secretary Usha Sharma and other senior officials of the state government held a meeting with a delegation of the agi-



tating private hospitals on Sunday and assured them to hold a discussion on their suggestions regarding the bill.

However, the doctors were adamant and said any discussion would be possible only after the bill was withdrawn. The bill was passed by the Assembly last week. Private doctors say that the bill will increase bureaucratic interference in their functioning.

According to the Rajasthan Right to Health Bill, passed by the Assembly on Tuesday, every resident of the state will have the right to emergency treatment and care "without prepayment" at any "public health institution, health care establishment and designated health care centres".

Countrywide Covid mock drills planned on April 10-11

Alert at the fast spreading XBB.1.16 of SARS-CoV-2 which is believed to be behind the fresh surge of Covid infections in the country, the Center has asked the States to conduct mock drills in hospitals to ensure operational readiness of hospital infrastructure including oxygen cylinders, PSA plants, ventilators and human resources. Countrywide mock drills have been planned to be conducted on April 10-11.

According to the INSACOG data, a total of 610 variant XBB.1.16 samples have been found across 11 states and Union Territories with the highest number found in Maharashtra and Gujarat at 164 each, followed by 93 Telangana and 86 in Karnataka.

In yet another advisory issued on Monday, the Centre after reviewing public health

preparedness for management of Covid-19 and Covid-19 vaccination progress with States asked them to strengthen surveillance with focus on whole genome sequencing of positive samples and increase testing with higher proportion of RT-PCR tests.

On their part, States are gearing up to meet any emergency in case the infections spurt. For instance, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Monday reviewed the Covid-19 and influenza situation at a high-level meeting with officials and directed them to identify covid-dedicated hospitals in all 75 districts.

He directed officials to test preparations by conducting mock drills in hospitals across the state on April 11-12 and ensure that all the oxygen plants in the state are functional and ventilators provided to hospitals and medical colleges are active.

Cong seeks to placate Sena UBT over Rahul's Savarkar comment

After the Shiv Sena (UBT) announced its decision to skip the dinner meeting of the Opposition parties hosted by the Congress over Rahul Gandhi's repeated comments on Veer Savarkar, the Maharashtra Congress on Monday sought to mend fences with the Uddhav Thackeray-led Sena by saying that his party and Sena had come together to fight the BJP despite the fact that the two parties had different views on Savarkar.

A day after Shiv Sena (UBT) president Uddhav Thackeray said that his party would not any tolerate insult heaped on Savarkar, his party MP Arvind Sawant said that no one from his party would attend the dinner meeting convened by the Congress and that the grand-old party has to

understand Savarkar first. Resorting to a damage control exercise, Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee president Nana Patole said: "It is a well-known fact that Shiv Sena (UBT) and Congress have different views as far as Savarkar issue is concerned... Considering the political situation in the country, Congress, Shiv Sena and NCP have come together at least through a common program for a larger battle. Currently, the battle to save country, democracy and constitution is important. This battle is big and we are fighting together against the BJP".

"The Congress' stand towards Savarkar is clear right from the beginning. There is nothing new in it. But ruling BJP and Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena are trying to drive a wedge between Congress and Shiv Sena.

Saroj Bala, who lost two sons — Prince and Deepak — in the Dhangri terror attack on January 1, 2023 in the frontier district of Rajouri on Monday has threatened to return the ex-gratia amount and migrate from her village to a 'safer' place if State Government fails to identify the terrorists and bring them to justice.

Five people were killed in the firing by terrorists on January 1, while two minor children died in the IED explosion next morning. As many as 14 villagers were injured in the twin attacks. The attackers are still at large. Addressing a joint press conference inside Rajouri Press club premises, Saroj Bala flanked by other aggrieved

family members of the Dhangri terror attack victims thundered, "We don't need jobs.

We don't need money. We need justice. We are still waiting to see perpetrators behind bars. Dhangri village sarpanch Dheeraj Kumar said that money will be returned back to same account where from it was credited if justice is not provided to families. Expressing their displeasure over recent statement of DGP Dilbagh Singh that terrorists, who were behind Dhangri killings, belonged to Pakistan family members of Dhangri attack victims said same police officer had claimed that 80 percent of the case has been solved on day 3 of attack but till date 90 days have passed and still no one has been identified or arrested.

Suwendu meets Shah, slams Didi

He informed the bench that the plea filed by Nalini Chidambaram, a senior advocate and wife of Congress leader P Chidambaram, deals with a similar issue of summoning women accused by the ED.

2 women, 1 teen commit suicide in Rajasthan's Kota in 24 hours

Kota: Two women and a 17-year-old allegedly committed suicide by hanging themselves at their houses in Rajasthan's Kota within 24 hours, police said on Monday. In Bambulia village, 28-year-old Mamta hung herself at her home on Monday, two months after her husband Muralidhar died in a road accident, SHO Dhanraj Meena said.

The woman was depressed after her husband's death. Her 4-year-old son sustained serious leg injuries in same mishap, he said. On Sunday night, 17-year-old Krishna, a student of 12, died after hanging herself with a 'dupatta' at her home in Itawa town here, SHO Meena said.

The reason behind extreme step by the minor was yet to be ascertained as no suicide note was recovered from the spot, he said. According to family members, the deceased minor was good at studies and was currently appearing for board exam. Janki (35), a resident of Brijraj Colony in Kota city, also hung herself at her home on Sunday noon. The woman was mentally challenged and was undergoing treatment for her illness, Circle Inspector (Nayapura) Dayaram said.

BJP MLA arrested after his bail plea rejected in graft case by K'taka HC

The Lokayukta police arrested BJP MLA Madal Virupakshappa hours after the Karnataka High Court dismissed his bail petition in a bribery case relating to Karnataka Soaps and Detergents Limited (KSDL) on Monday.

The Channagiri MLA had got bail days after his son Prashant M V, who was caught while receiving a bribe of Rs 40 lakh from a contractor on March 2.

Subsequent raids led to the detection of unaccounted cash of Rs 8.23 crore from Virupakshappa's house, sources said.

"We arrested him in Tumakuru when he (the MLA) was on the way to Bengaluru," Lokayukta Inspector General of Police A Subramanyeshwara Rao told PTI.

The High Court had reserved its judgment in the matter last week. The case pertains to the alleged demand and receipt of bribes for allotting contract for supplying chemicals to the state-run company. Subsequent raids by the Lokayukta unearthed cash to the tune of Rs 8.23 crore.

Osmanabad, Aurangabad renamed due to history, Maha Govt tells HC

The Maharashtra Government on Monday told Bombay High Court that Aurangabad and Osmanabad were renamed Sambhaji Nagar and Dharashiv, respectively, due to history and not for political reasons.

The government filed its affidavits in response to two public interest litigations challenging the decision to change the names of these cities. The petitions claimed the decision was politically motivated. The government in its affidavits denied the name change was being effected for any such reason as alleged in the petitions.

"The state government has complied with all the necessary procedures involved in effecting change of name. The decision to change the name of Osmanabad to Dharashiv neither leads to any religious and communal hatred nor creates any rift between religious groups," the state government said. The affidavit said a majority of the people celebrated the name change.

The affidavit added that various records showed previously Osmanabad was known as Dharashiv.

Ankylosing spondylitis may lead to permanent disability, reveals study

New Delhi: Back pain due to exertion, bad posture and poor lifestyle could actually be Ankylosing Spondylitis (AS), a type of auto-immune rheumatic disorder (ARD), doctors have said here flagging concerns that it is hitting young in the 20s and 30s and can possibly lead to permanent disability. According to them, 3 percent of the total population of the country is suffering from some ARD.

If not taken seriously, its consequences can be serious in future, they warned. Dr Ranjan Gupta, Associate Professor, Department of Rheumatology, AIIMS talked in detail about ARD and Ankylosing Spondylitis (AS). "AS, a form of the ARD, is a serious challenge for the health of the youth.

He emphasized that creating awareness about this disease should be the prime objective as timely diagnosis of such diseases reduces the chances of further disability. "Even patients with severe disease can lead a normal life," Prof Jugal Kishore, Director and HOD of Community Medicine Department, Safdarjung Hospital, Delhi stressed on creating awareness at the social level regarding these diseases. "Awareness can play a big role



in the prevention of such diseases," he said on the sidelines of a cricket match 'ARD Warriors Trophy' held on Sunday at East Delhi Sports Complex (PDKP), Tahirpur, Yamunapar. It was organized by CAS India Foundation in association with Navdrishti Charitable Trust to create awareness about the disease.

CAS India Foundation head Ankur Sharma, who has the AS, said that the disease has been taking a toll on the youth at an age when they dream of education, career and better future. "But this disease leaves them disabled. It is disappointing that patients are not covered by health insurance.

For a long time, even experts have been demanding to include it in the list of serious diseases and provide health insurance facilities," he said. Dr Gaurav Sharma, Orthopedic Surgeon at Delhi-based Swami Dayanand Hospital, explained that the AS is a joint fusion in patients and it also creates possibilities of joint replacement surgery. PNS

Transgressions may trigger escalation along LAC with China, says Army chief

Chief of Army Staff General Manoj Pande on Monday said transgressions remain the potential trigger for escalations along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China and asserted India has adequate reserves and was prepared to deal with any contingency.

He said China has accrued significant capacities for force mobilization, application, and sustenance of military operations and maintained the long-pending boundary issue can not be divorced from bilateral relations between the two Asian giants.

General Pande said Chinese attempts to carry out transgressions across the LAC in violations of past agreements/protocols remain a matter of concern for India, but the Army's preparedness remains of a high order, comments coming in the backdrop of the border standoff in eastern Ladakh that started in May 2020.

He was speaking at the 2nd Strategic Dialogue on 'Rise of China and its Implications for the World', organised by the Savitribai Phule Pune University and the New Delhi-based Centre for China Analysis and Strategy. "I think the most important aspect of our operational environment remains our legacy

challenges of the unsettled and disputed borders. Pockets of dispute and contested claims to the territory continue to exist due to differing perceptions of the alignment of the Line of Actual Control. Transgressions remain the potential trigger for escalations," the Chief of Army Staff cautioned.

Hence, Sino-Indian border management requires close monitoring as infirmities can lead to a wider conflict, General Pande said.

"As we all knew we have agreements/protocols — (signed in) 1993, 1996, 2005, and 2013 — in the military domain to maintain peace and tranquillity on the LAC. Of concerns remain the violations of these by China — with their attempt to carry out — transgressions across the LAC," he said.

The decades-old boundary issue can not be divorced from bilateral relations, General Pande asserted and went on to quote External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, who had said, "for (India-China) ties to return to the positive trajectory and remain sustainable - they must be based on three mutual sensibility, respect, and interest." New Delhi has repeatedly maintained that its ties with Beijing cannot be normal unless there is peace in the border areas.

Four boxing gold medals, beginning of Women's Premier League — women's sports have arrived

The last few days witnessed a huge fillip to the cause of women emancipation; and the best part of it was that it didn't come from young girls, not from the pompous speech of some politician or some hyped welfareist measure. Boxers Nitu Ghanghas and Saweety Boora won gold medals in Women's World Boxing Championships in their respective weight categories on Saturday; the next day, Nikhat Zareen and Lovlina Borgohain became world champions. Quite deservedly, India won the best team award at the tournament. This is not the first time that India have won more than one gold medal in a single year. In 2006, MC Mary Kom, Sarita Devi, Jenny RL and Lekha KC won a gold medal each in their categories. On Sunday, women also made their presence felt in another sport. Harmanpreet Kaur-led Mumbai Indians also won the inaugural edition of the Women's Premier League (WPL). The way all teams played in the tournament made the WPL very successful. While men's cricket is immensely popular in our country, the same cannot be said about women's cricket. Neither test matches nor one-day internationals nor T-20 games have been big draws till recently. In the beginning, WPL also had its anxious moments with concerns regarding filling up stadiums. The Board of Cricket Council of India (BCCI) was keen on audience attendance, so it kept



entry free for women and girls.

The BCCI did a lot to promote the WPL, so there were giant outdoor hoardings with women cricketers, something India is not much familiar with. A seven-storey wallpaper featuring the Mumbai Indians' trio Harmanpreet Kaur, Pooja Vastrakar and Nat Sciver-Brunt covering part of a 20-storey skyscraper near the busy Haji Ali Junction announced that women's cricket has arrived. There were other billboards as well. The point that needs to be underlined is that a lot of effort has gone into making women excel in sports. While it is true that Indians like cricket (cricket, it has been said, is an Indian game accidentally invented by the English), it was not making progress in our country till recently. The BCCI took a number of steps to promote WPL. Similarly, the Boxing Federation of India (BFI) in particular and other sports bodies in general put in a lot of effort to make our pugilists successful. Just before the four girls won gold medals, BFI's Bernard Dunne told a newspaper, "We are not just 'attack, attack and attack.' There is a thought process involved. India has never lacked heart, never lacked hard work. We are trying to bring those little changes within the programme, in terms of reducing the load. If you speak with the athletes, they would see they feel a lot fresher. Our performances demonstrate that. We have got very clear goals now." It is not just the government but also the private sector whose initiatives have ensured that women's sports have made a giant leap. The endeavour must go on.

Disqualification and aftermath

What is the future of Rahul Gandhi after his disqualification from Parliament? It is not over yet if we are to go by the history of politics in India

Is Congress leader Rahul Gandhi politically finished after the recent court verdict and his subsequent dismissal from Parliament? Is it an advantage or a setback for him and his party? It is too early to predict as it is an evolving story. But experience says that no politician is finished until he is finished.

The BJP is happy that the court has fixed Rahul and believes he is politically finished. However, the Congress claims Rahul is in a win-win position. It will be advantageous if a higher court stays or overturns the verdict. If it does not, Rahul is prepared to pay 'any price' and even go to jail, which might give him more political mileage.

Why did the court punish Rahul? Gandhi said at a campaign rally in Karnataka in April 2019: "Why do all these thieves have Modi as their surname? Nirav Modi, Lalit Modi, Narendra Modi?" In response, a BJP politician Purnesh Modi filed a criminal defamation complaint accusing Gandhi of defaming the "Modi community."

The ruling could have been milder. The court pronounced a two-year sentence on Thursday. The court also gave him bail immediately and suspended the sentence for a month. This allowed him time to appeal against the punishment. The defamation provisions used against Gandhi date back to the 1860s, when India was a British colony. Section 500 of the IPC makes the crime punishable by up to two years in prison.

Rahul will also be unable to contest the Lok Sabha elections for the next eight years apart from losing his present membership in the lower house. According to a historic Supreme Court decision in 2013, the membership of an MP or MLA sentenced to two years or more ends immediately after the court convicts them. The Lok Sabha announced Rahul's dismissal the next day. Rahul needs three layers of support to escape the situation: the strong backing of the united party, the united Opposition and the support of the public.

Congress responded that the



conviction was to divert the Adani issue in Parliament. Congress has demanded a joint parliamentary probe into the Adani-Henderson report. Rahul Gandhi said he would not "back down" from asking questions on the Adani stocks issue or be intimidated by threats, disqualifications, and prison sentences. Refusing to apologize for the remark, Rahul said: "My name is not Savarkar, my name is Gandhi. Gandhis don't apologize to anyone."

Secondly, the judgment united the Opposition against the ruling dispensation. Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal and other Opposition leaders, like Tamil Nadu chief minister M.K. Stalin, Former U.P. chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav, and former Maharashtra chief minister Uddhav Thackeray joined the condemnation of the act. West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee was the first to condemn the action while opposing Congress for years.

Thirdly, though the pub-

lic is shocked at the punishment, the complete response is yet to come. The Congress is yet to take it to the streets to involve the people. As a result of Rahul's punishment, other contentious issues, such as Rahul's controversial Cambridge speech, have become more prominent. The BJP has stalled business in Parliament, demanding an apology from him.

Even though the conviction was a psychological blow to Rahul, his party, and the entire Opposition, it all depends on how it is communicated to the people. This is because they must handle the situation, translate it into public sympathy, and sustain it until the 2024 Lok Sabha polls. Critics are skeptical about this. Given the BJP's increasing popularity and tight control over the media, it might not be easy. But Gandhi will still be news.

In the coming months, before 2024, the Congress will face its first significant test in Karnataka, Rajasthan,

Madhya Pradesh, and Chhattisgarh. This will be a direct contest with the BJP. If the party wins the elections in these states, it will cheer the opposition. If the party loses, it will be a setback before the 2024 Lok Sabha polls and the party will have to reconcile itself with Modi completing the hat trick.

Rahul's success depends on many ifs and buts. This includes whether he will get a higher court order to stay his verdict and how the public reacts. Congress must also change the poll narrative for the 2024 polls. In short, the BJP cannot wish away Rahul. No politician is finished until he is finished. Rahul is no exception. The BJP probably realizes that it's best not to bring your opponent to the forefront of your campaign. The moral of the story is that politicians, whatever high positions they occupy, should have tight control over their tongues.

HARD SELTZERS ARE REPLACING ALCOHOL

Hard seltzers are healthier alternative to traditional alcoholic beverages

As the Indian alcohol industry continues to evolve, we are witnessing the rise of the latest category of beverages — Hard Seltzers. Compared to other alcoholic beverages, hard seltzer has an unusual taste and is often described as refreshing and fruity. It is also relatively new, having only gained popularity in the past decade. It has seen significant growth in the US, Canada, and Australia. While still in its nascent stage in India, the global success of Hard Seltzers can be attributed to its low-calorie, low-carb, and gluten-free nature, making it an attractive option for the health-conscious consumer.

As health and wellness become increasingly a priority to consumers, traditional alcoholic beverages, which are high in calories and sugar, are losing their appeal. Hard Seltzers, low in calories and carbs, appeal to this new generation of active, health-conscious consumers. Historically, beer and other alcoholic beverages have been marketed primarily toward men, while wine and cocktails have been marketed toward women. However, true seltzer is marketed as a gender-neutral and inclusive drink. Its light and refreshing taste appeals to both men and women. Its packaging is often unisex, which allows it to appeal to a wider range of consumers.

Fine tune PM-KISAN to be efficacious

The inclusion of ineligible persons on the beneficiaries list of PM-KISAN raises concerns and undoes the very purpose the scheme was launched for

A significant decline in the number of farmers receiving income transfers under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) Scheme from 104 million during 2021-22 to 80 million during 2022-23 and a corresponding reduction in payment from Rs 67,032 crore in 2021-22 to Rs 57,646 crore in 2022-23 has caused much consternation.

Launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on February 24, 2019, and made effective from December 1, 2018, PM-KISAN is a Central Sector Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) Scheme under which the Union Government. It provides an income support of Rs 6,000 a year to farmers with a valid enrolment, paid in three equal cash transfers of Rs 2,000 each every four months. The money is credited to their account via the DBT mode.

Any landholding farm household is eligible for cash transfers, provided they don't pay income tax, hold government posts, or are retirees receiving pensions above Rs 10,000. The cutoff date for beneficiary identification based on Agriculture Census 2015-16 estimates is February 1, 2019. The total number of beneficiaries intended to be covered under the scheme was about 140 million.

Since the launch of the scheme, Rs 250,000 crore has been given to nearly 110 million farmers spread over 13 installments. Having decided who should be eligible to receive income transfer, with time, the number of beneficiaries can only increase as more farmers are added to the list. There is no reason for the number to go down. Unlike other schemes such as NREGA, where the number of beneficiaries covered and payments made thereof is linked to the availability of work, under PM-KISAN, all farmers in the beneficiaries list once decided are entitled to receive the money.

It is only plausible that the farmers (24 million) were incorrectly identified and, therefore, ineligible to receive assistance if there was a reduction. Their names have now been dropped from the list. This has ensured that they haven't received pay-

ments during 2022-23 and will not in the future. What about the money already given to them during 2021-22 and even before that?

The Centre claims it has a 'smooth' and 'transparent' recovery mechanism in place. This is where by the ineligible beneficiaries are identified and the money is auto-transferred from the state nodal department's account to the Central Government account. Hopefully, it would have recovered all the excess payments made during the relevant years. The process should be expedited in cases where it hasn't been done yet. But the inclusion of 'ineligible' persons in the beneficiaries list raises concern. This is all the more relevant since the Centre has adopted a robust and foolproof IT-based process for beneficiary identification. Let's look at the steps involved.



PM-KISAN WAS DESIGNED TO SUPPLEMENT THE FINANCIAL NEEDS OF SMALL AND MARGINAL FARMERS

The farmer registers on the PM-KISAN portal and the State validates her eligibility; after eligibility verification, the State uploads farmer details on the portal; the portal validates the records for junk data or duplicity; accepted data is forwarded to the public financial management system (PFMS) for account number and type validation; the list is sent back to States for the final approval; eligible records are available for generation of Request for Fund Transfer (RFT); signed RFTs are submitted to PFMS for generation of Fund Transfer Order (FTO); creation of sanction orders by agriculture ministry for approved FTOs; payment is processed and the beneficiary list is made available on the portal.

At all levels of authentication, the rejected data is sent back to the States for correction. At the foundation of this fintech architecture is 'confirming the genuineness of beneficiaries'; States have the sole

responsibility of doing this. In particular, it is important to know which documents they used for this purpose.

On a close scrutiny, it turns out that in the initial years, neither States used Aadhaar for validation nor the Centre made it compulsory; it was required to do so a year after the scheme's commencement. In such circumstances, a large number of 'ineligible' persons making their way to the beneficiary list was inevitable. Other issues related to the implementation of the scheme also deserve attention.

When launched, PM-KISAN was designed to supplement the financial needs of small and marginal farmers (SMFs), those with land holding less than 2 hectares, in procuring various inputs such as fertilisers, suitable quality seeds, pesticides, etc. To ensure proper crop health and appropriate yields, commensurate with farm income at the end of each crop cycle.

The scheme was meant to protect poor/vulnerable farmers (read: SMFs). Yet, within six months, from June 01, 2019, its scope was extended to cover all landholding farmers. In other words, the Government decided to give Rs 6,000 even to farmers with large landholdings who didn't deserve it. This meant an increase in beneficiaries by 25 million and expenditure by Rs 15,000 crore.

The Government should exclude better-off farmers from the beneficiaries' list. The money saved (Rs 15,000 crore annually) should be used to increase SMF support. Within this group, it may also consider giving more to marginal farmers, i.e., those with land holding less than 1 hectare in sync with PM Modi's philosophy of using national resources for the poorest of the poor.

Farmers in certain States don't benefit from the scheme. For instance, in Bihar, against a total of around 16 million potential beneficiaries, the state has uploaded only 6 million. West Bengal hasn't joined the scheme, thereby denying access to about 7 million farmers in the State; the Centre is now encouraging those farmers to apply directly on the portal. In other jurisdictions, coverage in some districts is poor. To address it, the Centre has taken some initiatives.

States that have achieved 90 per cent coverage are required to verify 100 per cent 25 randomly selected villages in districts where the coverage is low. In States where the coverage is less than 80 per cent, they need to verify 25 villages even in districts that are relatively high. These efforts should be vigorously pursued to ensure that all SMFs get income transfer in every nook and corner of the country.

There are millions of farmers who cultivate the land but don't own it. But, under the current arrangement for income support under PM-KISAN, they are not eligible; instead, the money is sent to the account of the person who owns the land. This anomaly should be corrected by securing data on all such tenant farmers and transferring the money to their accounts.

Finally, PM-KISAN is meant to meet the small SMF needs. It can't replace assuring them of a reasonable income on a sustainable basis. This won't be possible unless they get a reasonable price for their produce. This in turn, will require the resurrection of the now junked three Central farm laws. Unless this is done, episodes similar to that of a farmer from Maharashtra's Solapur getting a measly Rs 2.49 from the sale of over 5 quintal onions will continue to reverberate.

Embattled Netanyahu appeals for peace

Israeli President asks PM to halt judicial overhaul

Ahead of a much-anticipated announcement to freeze his plan for a judicial overhaul, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu Monday urged protesters "to behave responsibly and refrain from violence" as Israelis from all over the country started descending into Jerusalem and workers from a range of sectors joined a protest movement against the government's contentious plan.

Netanyahu's appeal came hours after President Isaac Herzog Monday appealed to him to immediately halt his controversial judicial overhaul, warning that the move has put the country's security, economy and society under threat.

Prime Minister Netanyahu in his first public statement since widespread demonstra-

tions erupted in reaction to his sacking of the defence minister has urged protesters, from the left and right, "to behave responsibly and refrain from

'Diplomats strike against govt plan'

Tel Aviv: The spokesman for Israel's largest trade union says diplomats at Israeli missions abroad are also striking against the government's plan to overhaul the judiciary.

Yaniv Levy, the Histadrut spokesman, said the missions were providing only emergency services. Ambassadors and consuls-general were among those on strike. Workers from across a range of fields went on strike Monday, in a bid to ramp up pressure on Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to scrap the overhaul plan. AP

this evening between opponents and supporters of the government's judicial overhaul plan. "All of us are brothers and sisters," Netanyahu stressed in his tweet. Unverified reports in

the local media, quoting sources in Netanyahu's Likud party, have said that the Prime Minister is going to freeze the judicial blitz that has completely paralysed the nation with widespread strikes across all walks of life.

President Herzog's remarks came after Prime Minister Netanyahu sacked Defence Minister Yoav Gallant for opposing his judicial reforms, sparking widespread street protests. The president also called on the government to put aside political considerations for the sake of the nation.

"Last night we witnessed very difficult scenes. I appeal to the Prime Minister, members of the Government, and members of the Coalition: there are harsh and painful feelings. The entire nation is rapt with deep worry," Herzog said. "Our security, economy, society — all are under threat. The whole people of Israel are looking at you. The whole Jewish People are looking at you. The whole world is looking at you," the ceremonial president in a statement.

China silent on reports of skipping G20 meet in Arunachal Pradesh

China on Monday declined to react to reports that its officials skipped a "confidential" G20 meeting held in Arunachal Pradesh, which Beijing claims as part of the mainland.

When asked about reports that China has abstained from the meeting held on Sunday at Itanagar, the capital of Arunachal Pradesh, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning told a media briefing here "I am not aware of what you said." "I have to check it with my colleagues," she said. The question and her reply did not figure in the official transcript of the media briefing posted on the Chinese Foreign Ministry website hours later. China claims

Arunachal Pradesh as part of South Tibet. India firmly rejects China's claims and asserts that the state is an integral part of the country.

Chinese Foreign Minister Qin Gang visited New Delhi earlier this month to attend the G20 Foreign Ministers'



Meeting. Qin also met External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on March 2. The meeting was the first between Jaishankar and Qin after the latter became the Chinese foreign minister in December.

Taiwan's former leader Ma begins China visit

Taoyuan (Taiwan): Former Taiwan President Ma Ying-jeou departed for a tour of China on Monday, in what he called an attempt to reduce tensions a day after Taiwan lost one of its few remaining diplomatic partners to China. The ex-president is visiting in a private capacity, bringing a delegation of academics and college students for exchanges, as well as members of his family, but the trip is loaded with political meaning.

Ma's policies brought Taiwan and Beijing to their closest relationship ever, but his exit from office was overshadowed by massive protests against a trade deal with the mainland and his successor has focused on bolstering ties with the US and defending the autonomy of the democratically governed island that China claims as part of its own territory. Current President Tsai Ing-wen is expected to launch a 10-day diplomatic tour of her own Wednesday, ostensibly to visit the island's remaining allies in Latin America. She will stop in the US, Taiwan's biggest unofficial partner and supplier of arms.

Ma's visit comes amid rising tensions. Beijing has stepped up pressure against Taiwan in recent years, poaching its diplomatic allies while also sending military fighter jets flying towards the island on a near daily basis. On Sunday, Honduras established diplomatic relations with China, leaving Taiwan with only 13 countries that recognise it as a sovereign state. Ma, a member of the opposition Nationalist Party (Kuomintang), will land in Shanghai before starting his visit in nearby Nanjing. He is expected to tour the mainland from March 27 to April 7, stopping in Wuhan and Changsha, as well as other cities. He is bringing college students from Taiwan to meet with fellow students from Shanghai's Fudan University and Changsha's Hunan University. Ma has framed the visit as a bid to lower the tensions in cross-strait relations through people to people exchange. AP

Streets seethe with protest in France

A big day has come for French high school student Elisa Fares. At age 17, she is taking part in her first protest. In a country that taught the world about people power with its revolution of 1789 — and a country again seething with anger against its leaders — graduating from bystander to demonstrator is a generations-old rite of passage. Fares looks both excited and nervous as she prepares to march down Paris streets where people for centuries have similarly defied authority and declared: "Non!"

Two friends, neither older than 18 but already protest veterans whose parents took them to demonstrations when they were little, are showing Fares the ropes. They've readied eye-drops and gas masks in case police fire tear gas — as they have done repeatedly in recent weeks.



"The French are known for fighting and we'll fight," says one of the friends, Coline Marionneau, also 17. "My mother goes to a lot of demonstrations... She says if you have things to say, you should protest." For French President Emmanuel Macron, the look of determination on their young faces only heralds deepening crisis. His government has ignited a firestorm of anger

with unpopular pension reforms that he railroaded through parliament and which, most notably, push the legal retirement age from 62 to 64.

Furious not just with the prospect of working for longer but also with the way Macron imposed it, his opponents have switched to full-on disobedience mode. They're regularly striking and demonstrating and threatening to make his

second and final term as president even more difficult than his first. It, too, was rocked by months of protests — often violent — by so-called yellow vest campaigners against social injustice.

Fares, the first-time protester, said her mother had been against her taking to the streets but has now given her blessing. "She said that if I wanted to fight, she wouldn't stop me," the teen says. Critics accuse Macron of effectively ruling by decree, likening him to France's kings of old. Their reign finished badly: In the French Revolution, King Louis XVI ended up on the guillotine. There's no danger of that happening to Macron.

But hobbled in parliament and contested on the streets piled high with reeking garbage uncollected by striking workers, he's being given a tough lesson, again, about French people power.

Zelenskyy meets UN atomic agency chief

Zaporizhzhia: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy met Monday with UN atomic energy chief Rafael Mariano Grossi in southern Ukraine where they discussed the precarious situation at the Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant. The plant, which is Europe's biggest, has lost several of its power transmission cables during Russia's war, and on multiple occasions has had to switch to emergency diesel generators.

Grossi, who is director-general of the Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency, plans to visit the plant, which is held by Russian forces, this week. The agency has permanent staff stationed at the plant.

In the meeting, covered exclusively by The Associated Press, Grossi expressed his concern to Zelenskyy that the situation at the plant "isn't getting any better." He stressed that the



situation at the plant remains tense because of the militarisation of the area around it and the recent blackout at the plant. It wasn't the first time that has occurred since Russian forces last year took it over.

The two met in the city of Zaporizhzhia, which is in Ukrainian-held territory, about 50 kilometres (30 miles) north-east of the nuclear plant with the same name. Elsewhere, two people were killed and 29 wounded Monday when Russian forces shelled the

Ukrainian city of Sloviansk, in the partially occupied eastern Donetsk region, local officials said. Video footage of the aftermath showed damaged residential buildings, debris in the streets and vehicles on fire.

Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy described the attack as "terrorism." Russia has denied targeting residential areas even though artillery and rocket strikes have hit Ukrainian apartment buildings and civilian infrastructure daily during the war. AP

Suicide bomber kills 6 in Kabul

Islamabad (AP): A suicide bomber struck on Monday near the foreign ministry in Kabul, killing at least six people and wounding several, according to officials. It was the second time this year that there has been an attack near the ministry. There was no immediate claim of responsibility for the bombing but the regional affiliate of the Islamic State group has increased attacks since the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan in mid-August 2021. IS has targeted Taliban officials and patrols, as well as members of the country's minority Shiites.

According to Khalid Zadrani, a spokesman for the Kabul police chief, Taliban security forces spotted the bomber before he was able to reach a checkpoint at the Malik Asghar intersection, near the ministry. The attacker then detonated his explosives, killing at least six civilians. Three

members of the Taliban security forces were among those wounded in the attack.

The Kabul hospital run by the EMERGENCY non-governmental organisation said it received two fatalities from the explosion and 12 wounded, including a child. In mid-January, an IS attack near the ministry killed at least five people and wounded several others.

Checkpoints line the fortified route to the ministry, which is on one of the roads leading to the presidential palace. Guards stop and search vehicles and people along the way. The Islamic State group has also claimed other recent attacks in Kabul, including a bombing near a checkpoint at the city's military airport that killed and wounded several people and also an assault on a Kabul hotel in mid-December.

Prince Harry in court as privacy case against newspaper begins

Britain's Prince Harry, who now lives in the US, made a surprise appearance at the High Court in London on Monday as his legal action against a newspaper group for breach of his privacy began. The 38-year-old Duke of Sussex is among a group of celebrity claimants, including singer Elton John and actor Liz Hurley, who are suing the Associated Newspapers Limited (ANL) for "abhorrent criminal activity" and "gross breaches of privacy" as part of alleged phone-tapping.

ANL, the publisher of 'Daily Mail' newspaper, denies the allegations as "preposterous smears" and Monday's preliminary hearing will consider their legal arguments for a judge to decide whether the case will go further to a full hearing. A spokesperson for ANL also said the allegations were "unsubstantiated and highly defamatory claims, based on no credible evidence." The four-day preliminary hearing is set to include ANL's bid for the claims to be dismissed without a trial.

The legal action was announced in October 2022, when law firm Hamblins representing Prince Harry set out a number of allegations against the newspaper group, including hiring



of private investigators to secretly place listening devices inside people's cars and homes and commissioning of individuals to surreptitiously listen into and record people's private telephone calls, among others.

In a statement released at the time, the newspaper group said: "We utterly and unambiguously refute these preposterous smears which appear to be nothing more than a pre-planned and orchestrated attempt to drag the Mail titles into the phone hacking scandal concerning articles up to 30 years old." These unsubstantiated and highly defamatory claims — based on no credible evidence — appear to be simply a fishing expedition by claimants and their lawyers, some of whom have already pursued cases elsewhere," it said.

Sunak launches crackdown on anti-social behaviour

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak on Monday launched a new Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan to crack down on illegal activities within communities by handing additional powers to the police to punish drug-related offences and criminal gang activity. Under the new Immediate Justice scheme, those found committing anti-social behaviour will be made to repair the damage they inflicted on victims and communities, with an ambition for them to start work as soon as 48 hours after their offence.

Offenders, who will be made to wear high-visibility vests or jumpsuits and work under supervision, could be made to pick up litter, remove graffiti and wash police cars as punishment for their actions.

Victims of anti-social behaviour from the local com-



munity will be given a say in offenders' punishments to ensure justice is "visible and fits the crime." "Anti-social behaviour undermines the basic right of people to feel safe in the place they call home," said Sunak. "The public have rightly had enough — which is why I am determined to restore people's confidence that those responsible will be quickly and visibly punished. This action plan maps out how we will tackle this issue with the urgency it deserves and stamp out these crimes once and for all — so that

wherever you live, you can feel safe in, and proud of your community," he said.

Under the plan's "zero-tolerance approach", Nitrous Oxide or "laughing gas" will also be banned to send a message to intimidating gangs that hang around high streets and children's parks and litter them with empty canisters.

The drug is now reported as the third most used among 16 to 24-year-olds in England and both the police and public have repeatedly reported links between use of this drug and nuisance or anti-social behaviour. "The British public are fed up with crime and nuisance behaviour in their neighbourhoods inflicting misery on people," said UK Home Secretary Suella Braverman. "There is no such thing as petty crime — not only does antisocial behaviour leave people feeling unsafe, it can also be a gateway into serious criminality.

Two shot at in US gurdwara

New York (PTI): Two people were shot at in a gurdwara in the US state of California, with authorities ruling out the incident as a hate crime. The shooting took place on Sunday around 2:30 p.m. at the Gurdwara Sacramento Sikh Society, according to Sacramento County Sheriff's Office spokesman Sgt. Amar Gandhi. The shooting took place during the gurdwara's first Nagar Kirtan, a traditional neighbourhood celebration for Indian religions such as Sikhism. Gandhi said a fistfight had broken out between two men on the temple grounds, the Sacramento Bee newspaper reported.

One of the men, Gandhi said, shot a friend of the other combatant. The second man involved in the fight then fired upon the first man and ran off. That second man remains at large, Gandhi said.

Sacramento County Sheriff's Office spokesperson Gandhi said the shooting is not related to a hate crime and described the incident as a shootout between two men who knew each other, the Fox40.com portal reported. Gandhi said the confrontation between the two men started as a hand-to-hand incident and turned into a shootout. One of the suspects is described as an Indian male while the other suspected shooter is in the hospital, Gandhi said.

Asked if there was an imminent threat to the area, the Indian-origin police official said the situation "looks very contained." "It puts a small stain on this peaceful, very joyous day," he said.

Harris visits Ghana's Prez, promises aid, investments

Accra (Ghana): US Vice President Kamala Harris on Monday praised Ghanaian President Nana Akufo-Addo for his "democratic principles" during a visit with the West African leader, who's facing rising discontent over inflation and fresh concerns about regional security. Harris is just beginning a weeklong trip to the continent that will also take her to Tanzania and Zambia, part of a concerted effort to broaden US outreach at a time when China and Russia have entrenched interests of their own in Africa.

On Monday, the vice president was welcomed into the Ghanaian presidential palace, called the Jubilee House, where she promised assistance with security in the nation and increased investments there.

"As president of Ghana, you have been very courageous and forward in terms of standing for democratic principles," Harris said to Akufo-Addo. "I thank you for the



friendship you have offered the United States." Akufo-Addo fast-grew one of the world's fastest-growing economies before the COVID-19 pandemic.

However, the cost of food and other necessities has been skyrocketing, and the country is facing a debt crisis as it struggles to make payments. In addition, sporadic fighting has increased in Ghana's north, which borders the more tumultuous nation of Burkina Faso and the Sahel, a region where local offshoots of al-Qaida and the Islamic State group have been operating. Akufo-Addo

called terrorism a "poison" that was spreading across West Africa, making the region unstable.

"We're spending a lot of sleepless nights trying to make sure we're protected here," he told the vice president as the two gathered in a conference room at the palace, their delegations seated on opposite sides of a long table. Akufo-Addo called for solidarity as countries like Ghana work to get their economies "back on track." He also expressed concern that private American investors tend to overlook the nation. AP

Complex housing Wright Brothers plane factory gutted

Dayton (AP): An early morning fire damaged a commercial building complex housing an historic airplane factory founded by the Wright Brothers in Ohio on Sunday, authorities said. Dayton fire crews were sent to the site just before 2:30 a.m. and found heavy fire throughout the complex. Fire crews used hoses to spray water on the flames and used aerial ladders to get water into openings in the roof.

The Dayton Daily News reports that crews were still on the scene nearly 12 hours after the fire was reported. Black smoke continued to stream from a collection of multiple hangar buildings, including historic Wright Brothers airplane factory hangars, and flames could be seen on the backside of the hangars, the paper reported.

Capt. Brad French said in a news release that the structure involved is listed on the National Historic Register as the first aircraft manufacturing facility founded by the Wright Brothers. Mackenzie Wittmer, executive director of the National Aviation Heritage Area, said in a Facebook post that the group was "deeply saddened by the fire that damaged our historic Wright Company airplane factory, the first-purpose built buildings for the aviation industry." Officials were working to assess the damage, Wittmer said.

Jack Ma returns to mainland China

Hong Kong (AP): Alibaba founder Jack Ma has resurfaced in China after months of overseas travel, visiting a school Monday in the city where his company is headquartered and discussed topics such as artificial intelligence. Ma founded e-commerce firm Alibaba in the 1990s and was once China's richest man.

He has kept a low profile with few public appearances since Nov. 2020, when he had publicly criticised China's regulators and financial systems during a speech in Shanghai.

Shortly afterward, authorities put the brakes on the initial public offering of Alibaba's financial affiliate Ant Group, which had been set to raise \$34.5 billion in what would have been the world's largest share offering at the time. Alibaba was later investigated and fined \$2.8 billion for breaching antitrust rules as Chinese authorities cracked down on the once-freewheeling technology industry.



In the past year, Ma has been travelling, with reports of sightings in Europe, Japan, Thailand and Hong Kong. His itinerary has been closely watched as a barometer of Beijing's attitude towards private businesses.

On Monday, Ma visited the Yungu School in Hangzhou, in eastern China, that was established by Ma and other partners of Alibaba, according to a WeChat post by the school. Ma discussed technologies such as the artificial intelligence chatbot ChatGPT, and spoke of his passion for learning. Alibaba did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

Pak begins talks on SCO participation

Pakistan has begun in-house consultations to decide whether to attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) meetings of the defence and foreign ministers in India, a report said on Monday. New Delhi has already extended invitations to Defence Minister Khawaja Asif and Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari. The defence ministers' meeting is scheduled in April in New Delhi while foreign ministers would meet in May in Goa, according to the Express Tribune.

India, the current president of the eight-nation SCO, is holding a series of events. Barring one event where Pakistan was denied entry over a map controversy, Islamabad has attended all other events, including the chief justices' conference and meeting of energy ministers via video link. However, a three-member Pakistan military delegation headed by a Brigadier attended the meeting of an expert working group under the Council of Defence Ministers in person in New Delhi on Thursday.

The presence of the

Pakistani delegation in New Delhi has raised the possibility of defence and foreign ministers travelling to India. While the Foreign Office (FO) spokesperson insisted that the final decision would be taken closer to the events, sources said that in-house consultations are already underway.

The authorities are currently divided over attending the high-profile meetings hosted by India. One view is that given the current state of the bilateral relationship, Pakistan, if required, would only send junior officials to the SCO meetings. However, other officials do not agree with this. They believe that Pakistan must not leave such key regional forums unattended, and since SCO comprises powerful countries, including Russia and China, Pakistan must use this opportunity to advance its interests.

The ties between India and Pakistan came under severe strain after the Indian Air Force fighter jets pounded a Jaish-e-Mohammed terrorist training camp in Balakot in Pakistan in February 2019 in response to the Pulwama terror attack. The relations further deteriorated after India in

August 2019 scrapped the special status of Jammu and Kashmir and bifurcated the state into two union territories.

The Express Tribune quoted sources as saying that a lot will depend on China, Pakistan's closest ally. If China, being the founding member of SCO that played a key role in making Pakistan its full-time member, asks Islamabad to attend the meetings it would be difficult for the government to ignore the advice, the report said. Pakistan and India were accepted as full members of the SCO after both sides committed not to undermine regional focus by bringing up their bilateral issues.

Sources told the newspaper that foreign minister Bilawal was keen to go to India for the SCO meeting. If Pakistan attends the defence and foreign ministers' meetings, it is possible that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif may also go to India in July for the SCO summit. Sources said the final decision about Pakistani participation in SCO ministerial meetings and a summit would be taken after due diligence. It would also depend on the political situation in Pakistan, they added.

Imran gets interim bail in 7 cases

PTI ■ ISLAMABAD

A Pakistani court on Monday granted interim bail to Imran Khan in seven different cases registered against him following clashes at the federal judicial complex here earlier this month when the former prime minister arrived from Lahore to appear in a corruption case hearing.

A two-member division bench of the Islamabad High Court (IHC), comprising Chief Justice Aamer Farooq and Justice Miangul Hassan Aurangzeb, heard the bail applications. Khan, the chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party, sought interim bail in seven cases registered against him in Golra, Bara Kahu, Ramna, Khanna and CTD police stations.

Barrister Salman Safdar, Khan's counsel, who filed the pleas, stated that the former prime minister would suffer "irreparable loss" if he was arrested. "Furthermore, being head of the single largest political party, there is an apprehension that his political adversaries and opponents would be able to further their nefarious designs and political ambitions if pre-arrest bail is not granted to the petitioner," according to the petition. The court after hearing

arguments granted interim bail to the former premier. Intense clashes erupted outside the judicial complex on March 18 when Khan arrived from Lahore to attend a much-awaited hearing in the Toshakhana case.

During the confrontation between PTI workers and police, over 25 security personnel were injured, prompting Additional District and Sessions Judge Zafar Iqbal to defer the court hearing in this case till March 30. A video posted on PTI's official Twitter on Monday showed Khan entering the court premises with Islamabad police guarding his bullet-proof vehicle.

Pak-origin Humza Yousaf declared leader of Scottish National Party

London (PTI): Pakistani-origin Member of the Scottish Parliament (MSP) Humza Yousaf on Monday won the Scottish National Party (SNP) leadership contest and is set to be named as Scotland's new First Minister, replacing Nicola Sturgeon.

The 37-year-old MSP served as the Health and Social Care minister in Sturgeon's Cabinet until she announced her resignation last month, triggering a leadership contest within the governing party for the devolved region.

Yousaf defeated his closest rival finance minister Kate Forbes, who spent some of her formative years in India, where her parents worked as Christian missionaries, and now faces a vote at the Scottish Parliament of Holyrood on Tuesday before being formally confirmed as the region's First Minister.

"It is hard for me to find the words to describe just how honoured I am to be entrusted by our membership of the SNP to be the party's next leader and to be on the cusp of being our country's next First Minister," Yousaf said in his victory speech in the Scottish capital of Edinburgh.

Yousaf said he felt "like the luckiest man in the world" as he thanked his wife and children for their support. "I feel like the luckiest man in the world to be standing here as leader of the SNP, a party I joined almost 20 years ago and that I love so dearly," he said.

Yousaf said he would serve "in the interests of all party members" and "lead Scotland in the interests of all of our citizens, whatever your political allegiance." He vowed to be a First Minister "for all of Scotland". The Glasgow-born and bred politician is the son of Pakistan-born Muzaffar Yousaf, whose family migrated from Mian Channu to Glasgow in the 1960s. Yousaf's mother, Shaista Bhutta, was born in Kenya and migrated with her family to Scotland too.

N Korea test-fires 2 more missiles as US sends carrier

A nuclear-powered US aircraft carrier and its battle group began exercises with South Korean warships on Monday, hours after North Korea fired two short-range ballistic missiles in an apparent protest of the allies' expanding drills.

The seventh missile test this month underscored heightening tensions in the region as both the North's weapons tests and the US-South Korea joint military exercises have intensified in a cycle of tit-for-tat. The launches may have been timed for the arrival of the USS Nimitz and its strike group, including a guided missile cruiser and two destroyers, which engaged in air defense exercises and other drills with South Korean warships in waters near Jeju island.

Jang Do Young, a South Korean navy spokesman, said the drills were aimed at sharpening joint operational capabilities and demonstrating the U.S. commitment to defend its ally with the full range of options, including nuclear, in face of the North's "escalating nuclear and missile threats." The Nimitz strike group was expected to arrive in the South Korean mainland port of Busan on Tuesday.

South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff said the two North

Korean missiles were fired from a western inland area south of the North's capital of Pyongyang from around 7:47 am to 8 am and travelled around 370 kilometers (229 miles) before landing at sea. Japan's military said the missiles, which landed outside Japan's exclusive economic zone, flew on an irregular trajectory and reached a maximum altitude of 50 kilometers (31 miles).

Japan has previously used similar language to describe a North Korean solid-fuel missile apparently modelled after Russia's Iskander mobile ballistic system, which is designed to be maneuverable in low-altitude flight to better evade South Korean missile defences. North Korea also has another short-range system with similar characteristics that resembles the US MGM-140 Army Tactical Missile System.

Japanese Chief Cabinet Secretary Hirokazu Matsuno said North Korea may dial up its testing activity further with more missile launches or even conducting its first nuclear test since September 2017. The South Korean and Japanese militaries denounced the latest launches as a serious provocation threatening regional peace and said they were working with the United States to analyze the missiles further.

Pak's electronic media watchdog bans live coverage of rallies

Islamabad (PTI): Pakistan's electronic media watchdog banned the live coverage of rallies and public gatherings in the federal capital on Monday, hours before former prime minister Imran Khan was scheduled to appear before a top court here seeking interim bail in seven cases.

The PEMRA issued this communicate after law enforcement agencies said Khan's appearance before the Islamabad High Court could lead to a possible law and order situation in and around the federal capital. The watchdog observed that

satellite television channels run live footage/images of violent mobs attacking police and law enforcement agencies.

"Such footage or images were seen on TV without any editorial oversight during the recent standoff between political party workers and law enforcement agencies in Lahore and Islamabad wherein, the violent mob used petrol bombs, injuring armless (sic) policemen and blazing (sic) police vehicles," it observed. It said that airing footage on different satellite TV channels "created chaos and

panic" among viewers and the police. "Such activism by mob not only jeopardises law and order situation but also makes public properties and lives vulnerable," it warned.

PEMRA said airing such content would be tantamount to the violation of several Supreme Court judgments. Earlier, PEMRA banned satellite television channels from broadcasting live and recorded speeches of Khan with immediate effect, hours after the former premier dodged arrest and made "provocative statements against state institutions."

Pak ex-PM moves court against Interior Minister

Islamabad (PTI): Imran Khan filed an application in a Pakistani court here on Monday against Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah for calling the former premier an "enemy" of his party.

Sanaullah, who is very close to former premier and London-based PML-N supremo Nawaz Sharif, said when the ruling party feels that its existence is under threat, it will go to any extent against its chief political rival.

In an interview with a private TV channel, the senior leader of PML-N termed the ex-PM and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf chief an "enemy" of his party and said Khan will be

"treated like that." "Either he will be eliminated from the political arena or us. He has now taken the country's politics to a point where only one of the two can remain - PTI or PML-N," Sanaullah said on Saturday.

The PTI said it has never witnessed in the past that a ruling party openly declared eliminating a popular leader of Pakistan. Seeking the Islamabad High Court's intervention on this issue, Khan has requested the court to block his arrest and prevent the respondents from acting on their "plans", according to The Express Tribune newspaper.

No atmosphere found at faraway Earth-sized world

Cape Canaveral (US): The Webb Space Telescope has found no evidence of an atmosphere at one of the seven rocky, Earth-sized planets orbiting a nearby star.

Scientists said on Monday that doesn't bode well for the rest of the planets in this solar system, some of which are in the sweet spot for harbouring water and potentially life.

The NASA-led team reported little if no atmosphere exists at the innermost planet in the Trappist system, 40 light-years away. The researchers used a special technique geared toward a warm planet like this one. Results were published on Monday in the journal Nature.

Strike paralyses rail, air travel in Germany

AP ■ BERLIN

Trains, planes and public transit systems stood still across much of Germany on Monday as labour unions called a major one-day strike over salaries in an effort to win inflation-busting raises for their members.

The 24-hour walkout — one of the biggest in decades — also affected cargo transport by rail and ship, as workers at the country's ports and waterways joined the strike.

Many commuters opted to drive to work, causing some delays on the roads, while those who could worked from home. Unions are seeking a pay increase of at least 10.5% and have dismissed offers from employers of about 5% over two years plus one-off payments.

High inflation also seen elsewhere last year has hit many workers hard, said Ulrich Silberbach of the Civil Service Federation. "We have recorded drops in

real wages and these need to be balanced out," he told reporters in Berlin, adding that some of his union's members in larger cities are having to apply for state benefits to afford rent.

Silberbach said that he hoped employers would increase their offer in

upcoming talks — otherwise, unions might have to consider an open-ended strike. His colleague Martin Burkert from the EVG rail union lamented that workers' pay is a fraction of what some top managers earn.

But rail company Deutsche Bahn

called the union's demands exaggerated and warned that millions of commuters would be affected. "Thousands of companies that normally send or receive their goods by rail will also suffer," Deutsche Bahn spokesman Achim Strauss said.

"The environment and the climate will also suffer in the end. Today's winners are the oil companies." Three days of talks are scheduled between the two sides. Interior Minister Nancy Faeser, who represents the federal government in the negotiations, said her side would engage in the discussions in a "tough but also fair and constructive" fashion. Faeser said she was confident that a good solution can be reached.

Labour strikes are a regular occurrence in Germany and normally end in a compromise deal between unions and employers. The walkout already caused disruption and delays Sunday, as travellers scrambled to reach their destinations early.

UN-backed probe cites crimes against humanity in Libya

Geneva (AP): UN-backed human rights experts said on Monday there is evidence that crimes against humanity have been committed against Libyans and migrants in chaos-stricken Libya, including women being forced into sexual slavery.

The investigators commissioned by the UN-backed Human Rights Council also faulted the European Union for sending support to Libyan forces that they say contributed to crimes against migrants and Libyans, and called on EU authorities to review their policies toward Libya. The findings come in an extensive new report, based on interviews with hundreds of people, including migrants and witnesses, that wraps up a fact-finding mission created nearly three years ago to investigate rights violations and abuses in the North African country. The mission shared its findings with the International Criminal Court.

Oil-rich but largely lawless Libya has in recent years emerged as the dominant transit point for migrants seeking a better quality of life in

Europe. Activists have long decried horrible conditions suffered by migrants who were trafficked and smuggled across the Mediterranean.

Spokespersons for the government in the capital of Tripoli, which works in western Libya, and the forces of a powerful commander that controls eastern and southern Libya, were not immediately available for comment. The investigators found "reasonable grounds to believe that crimes against humanity were committed against Libyans and migrants throughout Libya", said Mohamed Auajjar, the head of the fact-finding mission. Speaking in Arabic through a translator at a news conference in Geneva, he said his team unearthed "numerous cases of arbitrary detention, murder, torture, rape, enslavement, sexual enslavement and enforced disappearance." The Libyan coast guard, which has received training and equipment from the EU, has worked "in close coordination" with trafficking networks in Libya, the report said.

France 24 suspended for interview with jihadi

Dakar (Senegal): Burkina Faso's military junta has suspended French broadcaster France 24, for interviewing a top jihadi rebel, a government spokesman announced on Monday.

The broadcasting of France 24's programmes will be blocked throughout Burkina Faso because of an interview the outlet did with the leader of an al-Qaida aligned group, Jean-Emmanuel Ouedraogo said in a statement.

"It is with regret that the government discovered two weeks ago an interview with the chief of al-Qaida in the Islamic Maghreb" on France 24, part of the France Medias Monde group. Without contesting the freedom of the channel's editorial choices, the government nevertheless questions the ethics that govern the professional practice of journalism on France 24," he said. By describing the views of the head of the rebel group, France 24 had acted as a communication agency for the jihadis and gave them space to legitimise their actions, he said. AP

Controversial vote law amendments passed by Iraqi parliament

Baghdad (AP): Iraqi lawmakers passed on early Monday controversial amendments to the country's election law that could undermine the chances for smaller parties and independent candidates to win seats in future polls.

The amendments increase the size of electoral districts, a move widely backed by the Coordination Framework, a coalition of Iran-backed parties.

The coalition forms the majority bloc in the current parliament, which brought Prime Minister Mohammed Shia al-Sudani to power last year. The bill passed in a 206-12 vote in the 329-seat assembly, according to media reports. The remaining lawmakers were absent from the hours-long session, which started on Sunday night. The amendments also reverse key articles passed ahead of the 2021 federal election and redraw the electoral maps to have Iraq return to one electoral district per each governorate.

'Real estate gets \$32 bn equity capital in 2018-22'

Likely to garner \$12-13 billion in 2023-24: CBRE

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Real estate sector has received an equity capital of \$32 billion during the last five years and is expected to attract \$12-13 billion during 2023-24 with office assets likely to garner maximum fund, according to CBRE.

Real estate consultant CBRE has estimated that equity flows in real estate sector will remain steady with expected investment at around \$12-13 billion over the next two years with an average \$6-7 billion flow per year.

Equity investments include those by private equity funds, pension funds, sovereign wealth funds, institutional investors, real estate developers, investment banks, corporate groups, and REITs, etc.

CBRE expects that office assets would continue to garner a majority share of total institutional inflows, followed by Industrial & Logistics (I&L) and sites/land parcels. In addition, alternative investments, particularly in data centres, may take off.

Anshuman Magazine, Chairman & CEO — India, South-East Asia, Middle East &



Africa, CBRE. "India's strong underlying economic and demographic fundamentals, coupled with the evolving global trade landscape across sectors, builds a strong case for higher investments in real estate in 2023."

"China+1 strategy being adopted by many global corporates to de-risk supply chain requirements and mitigate production challenges is expected to benefit India. This would lead India to capture an increased market share in the global supply chain over the next 5-6 years," he added.

This would trigger the economy to grow at a higher CAGR, outpacing the world average and making India one of the attractive real estate investment destinations,

Magazine said.

During the next two years, in terms of locations mainly metros and tier-1 cities are likely to continue to be the major recipients of equity inflows.

According to CBRE data, the equity flow in real estate stood at \$5.9 billion in 2018, \$6.4 billion in 2019, \$6 billion in 2020, \$5.9 billion in 2021 and \$7.8 billion in 2022.

During the 2018-22 period, Mumbai followed by Delhi-NCR and Bengaluru dominated cumulative investments accounting for 63 per cent share since 2018. This translates to about \$20 billion worth of equity capital deployed across these cities out of \$32 billion equity flows in the last five years.

Sensex snaps two-day losing streak on gains in RIL, Maruti

Nifty tests 17k level

Equity benchmark Sensex snapped two-day losing streak to close 126 points higher on Monday, propped up by buying in index heavyweights Reliance Industries, Maruti and SBI amid a higher opening in European equities.

However, investors remained cautious amid stress in the US and European financial systems, traders said.

The 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 126.76 points or 0.22 per cent to finish at 57,653.86. During the day, the index witnessed a high of 58,019.55 and a low of 57,415.02.

The broader NSE Nifty advanced 40.65 points or 0.24 per cent to end at 16,985.70, with 27 of its scrips ending in the green.

Reliance Industries emerged as the biggest gainer in the Sense pack, rising 1.54 per cent, followed by Maruti, Sun Pharma, State Bank of India, UltraTech Cement, Infosys, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Hindustan Unilever, ITC and HDFC Bank.

On the other hand, Power Grid, Axis Bank, Mahindra & Mahindra and Tata Motors were among the major lag-



gards. A strengthening rupee bolstered sentiment, even as relentless foreign capital outflows restricted the gains, according to traders.

"The market ended mixed with marginal gains in large caps while mid and small caps had losses. Some certainty was seen in domestic banks and large caps due to ease in the US and European markets aided by reports on the acquisition of SVB by US lender First Citizens Bank.

"However, investors continue to remain cautious as stress in the US and European financial systems makes their central banks' actions complex," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services.

In the broader market, the BSE smallcap gauge ended 1.50 per cent lower while the mid-cap index dipped 0.37 per cent.

Among sectoral indices, healthcare, FMCG, bankex, metal and teck were the gainers.

All 10 Adani group firms end lower; Adani Power, Adani Transmission fall nearly 5%

All the ten listed firms of the Adani group ended the day in the negative territory on Monday, with Adani Power, Adani Transmission, Adani Wilmar and Adani Total Gas falling nearly 5 per cent each.

Shares of Adani Power tanked 4.98 per cent, Adani Transmission tumbled 4.98 per cent, Adani Wilmar dived 4.93 per cent and Adani Total Gas slumped 4.91 per cent on the BSE.

The stock of NDTV went lower by 4.60 per cent, Adani Green Energy fell by 4.40 per cent, Adani Ports dropped 1.43 per cent, ACC dipped 1.01 per cent, Adani Enterprises declined 0.99 per cent and Ambuja Cements (0.59 per cent).

Many of the group firms hit their lower circuit limits during the day.

In the equity market, the 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 126.76 points or 0.22 per cent to finish at 57,653.86 after a



volatile trade.

Out of the ten listed firms of the Adani group, seven companies ended the day in the negative territory on Friday. Stocks of eight Adani group companies out of the 10 listed entities closed in the green on Wednesday. On Thursday, five group stocks ended higher, while five of them finished lower.

The group stocks have taken a beating on the exchanges since the report by the US-based short-seller Hindenburg Research came in January this year.

The report had made a litany of allegations, including fraudulent transactions and

share-price manipulation, against it.

The group has dismissed the charges as lies, saying it complies with all laws and disclosure requirements.

Meanwhile, the NSE and BSE on Friday said Adani Total Gas and Adani Transmission will move to the first stage of the long term additional surveillance measure framework from March 27.

On March 10, both exchanges put the two companies under the second stage of the long-term Additional Surveillance Measure (ASM) framework.

In two separate circulars, the bourses said these securities will continue in the framework but will be moved from respective lower stage ASM from March 27.

The parameters for short-listing securities under ASM include high-low variation, client concentration, number of price band hits, close-to-close price variation and price-earning ratio.

FCI stops wheat auction under OMSS for now as procurement of fresh crop begins next month

State-owned Food Corporation of India (FCI) on Monday said wheat sale at discounted rates via e-auction to bulk consumers, institutions and state governments has been stopped for now as procurement of the fresh crop begins next month.

Under the Open Market Sale Scheme (OMSS), the FCI has sold 33 lakh tonnes of wheat till March 15 through e-auction, out of which, buyers have lifted 31 lakh tonnes of the grain so far. They have to lift the balance quantity by March 31.

"The last e-auction of wheat to bulk consumers was undertaken on March 15. The auction has been stopped for now as the procurement of the fresh crop will pick up in the coming days," FCI Managing Director Ashok K Meena told PTI.

Sale of wheat to institutions like Nafed and state governments under the OMSS has also been stopped. The wheat auction will resume only if there is a need to intervene in the market, he added.

The government in January had announced plans to sell wheat in the open market from its buffer stock under the OMSS in order to check rising wheat and wheat flour prices.

A total of 50 lakh tonnes of wheat was allocated for sale under the OMSS. Out of the



allocated quantity, FCI was mandated to sell a total of 45 lakh tonnes of wheat to bulk users till March 15 through weekly e-auctions.

About 3 lakh tonnes of wheat was earmarked for state governments and 2 lakh tonnes for institutions like Nafed for converting it into wheat flour and then selling at ₹27.50 per kilogramme.

Under the OMSS, the reserve price of fair and average (FAQ) quality wheat was also fixed at a discounted rate of Rs 2,150 per quintal, while for Under Relaxed Specifications (URS) wheat at Rs 2,125 per quintal.

FCI is the government's nodal agency for procurement and distribution of foodgrains. The government aims to procure 34.15 million tonnes wheat in the 2023-24 marketing year starting April, higher than 18.79 million tonnes purchased in the previous year.

Wheat procurement had declined last year due to a fall in domestic production and higher exports.

IDFC First Bank ties with Crunchfish to demonstrate offline retail payments

IDFC First Bank on Monday said it has partnered with Swedish company Crunchfish to pilot a project to demonstrate offline retail payments.

IDFC First Bank, is set to be a part of RBI's pilot project to enable offline payments, the private sector lender said, adding that the project will give access to digital payments even when there is no network.

The unique digital payment solution was designed by Crunchfish for merchants and customers under the RBI's Regulatory Sandbox Program, IDFC First Bank said in a release.

"This project will provide support for offline retail payments based on a Digital Cash platform to the payment ecosystem of India. IDFC FIRST Bank will be one of the first few banks to be a part of this pilot project by HDFC Bank," it said.

The application was approved by the RBI to demonstrate offline payments between two banks. The Development and Demonstration Agreement which is a non-commercial agreement has now been signed to give IDFC First Bank access to the Digital Cash SDK.

Commercial terms for deployment will be regulated in a Software License Agreement.

New debt mutual fund norms: AMC's open subscription for international schemes

Several asset management companies (AMCs) have opened up subscription for international schemes to maximise inflows ahead of new taxation rules for debt mutual funds kicking in from April 1.

The fund houses that resumed their international schemes are — Franklin Templeton Mutual Fund, Mirae Asset Mutual Fund and Edelweiss Mutual Fund.

Edelweiss Mutual has opened its all seven international funds for subscription from this Monday. It has started accepting switch-in or lumpsum transactions in these schemes.

"We had some limits, so we thought of letting investors take benefit of taxation by investing before March 31," Niranjan Awasthi, Head - Product, Marketing and Digital Business at Edelweiss AMC told PTI.

Mirae Asset has opened subscription in a lump sum



manner for three international ETFs and three Fund of Fund (FoF) based on these ETFs from March 27 onwards.

The existing Systematic Investment Plan (SIP) and Systematic Transfer Plan (STP) will reopen from March 29 onwards. However, fresh SIP and STP will not be allowed.

"Since we have limited room available to take fresh inflows, these funds are likely to get closed again in future for subscription, in order to comply with the current regulatory limit and applicable guidelines for the overseas funds," Siddharth Srivastava, Head - ETF Product & Fund Manager at Mirae Asset Investment Managers (India) Pvt Ltd said.

Bullish on Indian market; continuing to invest through partners: Coca-Cola prez

Global beverages major The Coca-Cola Company is bullish on the Indian market and is continuing to invest in the country through its partners, the company's President and Chief Financial Officer John Murphy said on Monday.

India's rapid progress in infrastructure, electrification and digitisation offer a long runway ahead for the economy to grow and it fosters confidence, he said at a media round table here.

A lot of development has taken place in urban and rural India, which has created an emerging middle class, ensuring growth for many years to come, he said.

Rupee gains 3 paise to close at 82.37 against US dollar

The rupee appreciated by 3 paise to close at 82.37 (provisional) against the US dollar on Monday, as a positive trend in domestic equities and a weak dollar supported investor sentiments.

against a basket of six currencies, fell 0.02 per cent to 103.09. Global oil benchmark Brent crude futures advanced 0.68 per cent to USD 75.50 per barrel.

According to Anuj Choudhary - Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, the Indian rupee appreciated amid positive domestic markets and a soft Dollar. However, positive crude oil prices capped sharp gains.

Sebi cancels registration of Capvision Investment Advisor for misleading investors

Capital markets regulator Sebi on Monday cancelled the registration of Capvision Investment Advisor for promising assured profit to clients in the securities market and misleading investors.

Capvision Investment Advisor was registered with Sebi as an Investment Adviser in June 2014. It is a partnership firm with partners Ravi Prakash Mishra and Rekha Mishra.

In its order, Sebi found that Capvision was engaged in "non-genuine and deceptive activity" of obtaining payments from clients to third-party bank accounts.

Further, Capvision has made representations to its clients, promising such assured returns and thus failed in its responsibility to act in a fiduciary capacity towards its clients. Accordingly, it has violated the code of conduct specified under the investment adviser (IA) rules.

Also, Sebi said that promising assured profit in the securities market amounts to misrepresentation and misleading investors. Such reckless conduct by Capvision intended to induce investors to deal in



securities constitutes 'fraud' under the PFUTP (Prohibition of Fraudulent and Unfair Trade Practices) Regulations.

The regulator noted that the entity being a registered intermediary has failed to appear in the proceeding and defend the allegation of violation of PFUTP Regulations.

In the past, two adjudication orders were passed against Capvision, levying penalties of Rs 75 lakh and Rs 8 lakh for flouting IA norms, however, these fines were not paid. Following this, recovery proceedings were initiated by Sebi in 2017 and 2018 and the bank accounts of Capvision were frozen.

Thereafter, Partner No 1 - Ravi Prakash Mishra, who was the main proprietor of Capvision, engaged one P Chourasiya to open new bank accounts for receipt of money from the clients of his investment advisory business.

LG starts manufacturing of Dual Inverter Air Conditioner Compressors in India

New Delhi: South Korean consumer durables maker LG Electronics on Monday said it has started manufacturing Dual Inverter Air Conditioner Compressors at its plant in Greater Noida. LG Electronics India, which is among the leading players in the residential air-conditioning market here, has invested around Rs 100 crore in the new facility in Uttar Pradesh.

The new line has a capacity to roll out one million units per year, the company said.

According to the company, it has 'become the first brand to manufacture its own Dual Inverter Air Conditioner compressor in India'. PTI

BMW plans to launch 19 car models in India this year; eyes double-digit growth

German luxury auto maker BMW plans to introduce 19 car models, including electric vehicles, in India this year as it looks to sustain double-digit sales growth in the country, a top company official said on Monday.

The car maker, which expects 2023 to be the best for it in terms of sales in the country so far, also aims for electric vehicles to account for about 15 per cent of its



overall sales this year.

The group also plans to introduce three bike models under the BMW Motorrad business in India this year.

"We are going to launch 22 products which includes 19 cars and three bikes dur-

ing this year," BMW Group India President Vikram Pawah told PTI in an interaction.

It would be a mix of all new product introductions and facelifts of existing model range, he added.

The company has been launching over twenty products a year for the last few years, Pawah said, adding, "two-third of our volume will be either new or refreshed products which is probably for the first time that so much of the product is changing in one year itself".

However, there is a 20-point gap between the two this season as the Gunners close in on a first league title in 19 years.

"We achieved Champions League qualification in Antonio's first season at the club. We thank Antonio for his contribution and wish him well for the future. "Cristian Stellini will take the team as acting head coach for the remainder of the season, along with Ryan Mason as assistant head coach." Spurs chairman Daniel Levy added: "We have 10 Premier League games remaining and we have a fight on our hands for a Champions League place. "We all need to pull together. Italy beat Malta 2-0 in qualifiers

"We knew the quality and the strength of the England team but the Ukrainian boys deserve better," he said. "It's a good team and it will progress." Ukraine narrowly missed out on qualifying for last year's World Cup in Qatar, losing a play-off to Wales. "We need time," said Rotan. "When you play a competitive game half a year after the last one it's a hard task to perform. "The Ukrainian team is getting younger. We've got future stars and in the future I'm sure we'll get good results against anyone." England have now picked up six points from their two qualifiers so far, with their win on Sunday following a 2-1 victory in Italy last week.

Nikhath eager to use World C'ship experience to win Olympic quota

In Miami, Andreescu has had a tough draw but has beaten two other former Grand Slam winners in Emma Raducanu and Sofia Kenin as well as seventh seed Maria Sakkari. Those results leave her unsurprisingly in a positive mood, but she says one of the keys to her overall happiness and balanced approach to the sport has been how she handles setbacks and defeats. "Obviously there were ups and downs, but for the most part, I was very, I guess, level throughout 2022, even with the losses. "I was like, it's fine. I'll go have dinner with my team. I'll go watch a movie, whatever, and not lock myself in the room for three days like I used to," she said.

World champions Nikhat and Lovlina Borgohain have already qualified for the Asian Games and thus have an opportunity to seal an Olympic berth at the continental event. "The performance in this tournament has been historic. Next is the Asian Games, let's see how we fare there. Preparation will go on continuously," he said. "We will try to identify our Olympic team as soon as possible-- all individuals in all categories — and focus on them, train them and study the opponents as well. Last time our preparation was left wanting."

Fritz has already won one tournament in Florida this year, taking the title last month at Delray Beach and in the fourth round, the American will be up against 19-year-old Holger Rune in who beat Argentine Daniel Schwartzman 6-4, 6-2. As always at Miami, there is a large contingent of Argentine tennis fans and they were vocal in their support for Schwartzman. But Dane Rune converted all four break points he earned in the hot afternoon sun. "My focus was really to step in every time I could and play my game. I think there were a few rallies where I didn't, but 95 per cent of the match was played on my terms, which was what I wanted," he said. Dutchman Botic van de Zandschulp triumphed for the third time in four meetings with Norway's world number four Casper Ruud, emerging with a 3-6, 6-4, 6-4 victory. The tight encounter, with a 75 minute third set, turned decisively towards Van de Zandschulp when he held to go 5-4 up with Ruud going wide at the end of a long rally. The Dutchman sealed victory, when on match point, Ruud's soft volley found the net. Italian Jannik Sinner continued his strong start to the year, defeating Bulgarian Grigor Dimitrov 6-3, 6-4. It was an error-strewn match in which players hit double the number of unforced errors to winners but Sinner handled Dimitrov's second serve well as he seeks his second Miami final appearance. Fourth-seed Daniil Medvedev moved into the fourth round after his scheduled third round opponent Alex Molcan of Slovakia withdrew from Monday's clash with a right hip injury.

WINNING CRUCIAL MOMENTS KEY TO MI'S SUCCESS: HARMAN

Mumbai Indians captain Harmanpreet Kaur feels that focussing on winning crucial moments of matches and not the ultimate prize worked well for her side, as they lifted the inaugural Women's Premier League trophy after a seven-wicket win over Delhi Capitals in the final here.

MI chased down the target of 132 with three balls to spare in the low-scoring but tense summit clash at the Brabourne Stadium on Sunday, with England all-rounder Nat Sciver-Brunt playing sheet-anchor with an unbeaten 60.

"(Right from start) we were talking about winning the moments. We were not looking for the trophy, we were looking to win all the moments. (We thought) if we win the moments, the trophy will come automatically," Kaur told reporters after Mumbai Indians' title win on Sunday.

Kaur said she was waiting for this moment for a long time, to win a trophy as a captain.

"It feels very good personally also. I was waiting for this moment for a long time when I could win something as a captain. It is also very important for women's cricket," she said.

"Many times we were there but could not make it. But here the tournament was different, the teams were different. Every side is so balanced and did well in the tournament."

Kaur's run out on Sunday reminded of her dismissal in the T20 World Cup semifinal against Australia, but



the MI captain said there was enough in her team's tank to overhaul the target.

"Both the run outs were quite disappointing. I was confident in the last match (India versus Australia) because we had so many wickets in hand. I thought we would be able to do it.

"But the scenario was a lot different here, we had Nat in the middle and

she was well settled. I knew who was going to bowl and how. We were quite positive to finish the game one or two overs left. But when I got out we thought we had to go by the situation," she said.

She said playing the Eliminator against Gujarat Giants helped her side gain momentum into the final.

"When we were doing well, the

only thought in mind was to not get into the elimination round. But after losing two matches we were in search of momentum. It went in our favour that we got one more match to play before the final and everybody got into the rhythm.

"It worked well in our favour. If you play after a long gap, it is tough to get back into momentum," Kaur explained.

The India captain was impressed with how Delhi Capitals players Shikha Pandey and Radha Yadav added 52 runs from just 24 balls for the unbroken 10th wicket, and asked them after the game to play similarly for the national team.

"I told Radha after the match that the way they were playing, I want to see the same approach when you come and play for India. She promised to come with the same approach."

Kaur said the inaugural WPL was an open tournament and all the five teams played well.

"This was not a one-sided tournament. The next season will be more exciting. People will be waiting for this. Every team did really well," she said.

Delhi Capitals coach Jonathan Batty lamented his side losing wickets in heaps against Mumbai Indians in the final.

"Losing three early wickets hurts you. The partnership between captain Meg (Lanning) and Marizanne (Kapp) got us back but then lost a flurry of wickets. That made it really hard but full credit (to the team) for going into the last over, (losing by) three balls left. We still had a chance of winning there at the end," he said.

Batty said Delhi Capitals respected the call made by third umpire against Shafali Verma, who fell off a full toss from Issy Wong.

"We could not tell, the third umpire is in the best position to adjudicate on that and gave what they thought was a fair dismissal and we just lost a wicket, it was just unfortunate timing," he said.

Mayers or Hooda likely to open with KL Rahul in LSG's first two games

In absence of Quinton de Kock, either West Indies southpaw Kyle Mayers or the flamboyant Deepak Hooda is likely to open the innings with skipper KL Rahul during Lucknow Super Giants' first two games in this edition of the IPL.

With the South African team playing two ICC World Cup qualifier 50-over games against the Netherlands on March 31 and April 2, none of their top players will be available for their respective IPL sides in the first couple of games.

Hence, LSG will be missing their regular opener de Kock, while their first match opponents Delhi Capitals will be without the services of Anrich Nortje and Lungi Ngidi.

LSG will take on DC on April 1 in Lucknow and then fly to Chennai for their next game against Chennai Super Kings.

"In case of De Kock, the best option is Kyle Mayers, who is also a left-hander and has a

decent strike rate of close to 135 in T20s. On Sunday, he was brilliant against South Africa during his 27-ball-51. So Mayers is favourite to partner Rahul in first two games," a source privy to developments in LSG camp said.

In case, LSG wants to beef up their middle-order or bowling arsenal with overseas recruits, then there is a case for talented Hooda to face the new ball alongside his skipper.

Hooda has already scored a century for India opening the innings in T20 cricket and has shown that he can be an enforcer in the Powerplay overs with his improvisation skills.

Mohsin Khan, who is currently doing his rehabilitation with LSG's strength and conditioning unit, is expected to miss at least first leg of the tournament but team think-tank feels he might be available for the second phase.

Jaydev Unadkat is the closest like-for-like replacement of Mohsin, although the Saurashtra

In fact, KKR's statement was an indicator that Iyer's chances of an early return to play looks

improbable at the moment.

"...Nitish Rana would captain the side in the absence of Shreyas Iyer, who is recovering from a back injury. While we are hopeful that Shreyas will recover and participate at some stage in the IPL 2023 edition, we feel fortunate that Nitish, with the captaincy experience having led his state side in white ball cricket and the IPL experience he has had with KKR since 2018, will do a great job," KKR said in a statement.

"We are also confident that under head coach Chandrakant Pandit and the support staff, he will get all the support needed off the field, and the highly experienced leaders in the squad will provide all support that Nitish may need on the field. We wish him the best in his new role and Shreyas a full and speedy recovery," it further stated.

While Rana has captained Delhi in Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy, the results have been far from encouraging for the southpaw. It is understood that he would be asked to implement the strategy prepared by coach Pandit, who along with team boss Venky Mysore and former Mumbai Ranji stalwart Abhishek Nayyar will be calling the shots.

It may noted that Rana was dropped by Delhi in this season's Ranji Trophy squad due to his poor show and inept technique in red-ball cricket.

Rana has captained Delhi in 12 T20s in the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy, with eight wins and four defeats. The 29-year old middle-order batter was bought by KKR ahead of the 2018 season and has been retained by the franchise ever since.

Rana 74 matches for KKR, scoring 1744 runs at a strike rate of 135.61.

Bangladesh beat Ireland in rain-hit 1st T20I

Rony Talukdar hit his maiden half-century to help Bangladesh secure a 22-run win against Ireland by DLS method on Monday in the opener of a three-match T20I series.

Talukdar struck 67 off 38 with seven fours and three sixes as opener to steer Bangladesh to 207-5 before rain halted the innings with four balls remaining.

Ireland's revised target was set for 104 in 8 overs but it managed only 81-5. Put into bat first, Bangladesh made a fluent start with Talukdar and Liton Das adding 81 runs in the first powerplay, eclipsing the previous high of 74 against Sri Lanka in

2018. Paceman Craig Young, who claimed 2-45, broke through with the wicket of Liton in the eighth over. Liton hit four boundaries and three sixes in his 23-ball 47. Talukdar slashed legspinner Ben White for a boundary through extra-cover to bring up his fifty off just 24 deliveries.

Shamim Hossain, who made 30 off 20, and skipper Shakib Al Hasan injected some spark as the side went past 200 runs for the fourth time in its T20 history.

Before the rain arrived, Bangladesh was batting on 20 off 13 with Mehidy Hasan Miraz on 4.

Paul Stirling, who is leading the team in the series after regular skipper Andrew Balbirnie



was rested, and Ross Adair scored 18 runs in the first over of left-arm spinner Nasum Ahmed to give the side a ray of hope. But pacer Hasan Mahmud rattled the stump of Adair (13) with a yorker and fast bowler Taskin Ahmed took the game literally away with three wickets in his first over. He started with Stirling, who made 17, and then dismissed Lorcan Tucker and George Dockrell. Taskin then came back to get rid of Tector to finish with his career-best 4-16. Gareth Delany scored a team-best 21 not out.

Indore pitch rating changed from 'poor' to 'below average'

The International Cricket Council (ICC) has changed the pitch rating of Indore's Holkar Stadium — the venue for the third Test between India and Australia — to 'below average' from 'poor' following a BCCI appeal.

The ICC also gave the Narendra Modi Stadium pitch in Ahmedabad, the venue for the fourth Test, an 'average' rating for the slow batting deck where both teams had one completed innings each. The match had ended in a tame draw, with India winning the series 2-1.

At Indore, Australia had defeated India by nine wickets

inside three days of the Border-Gavaskar Test to secure a World Test Championship final berth.

The ICC appeal panel reviewed the earlier decision of the match referee Chris Broad and found that there was not enough excessive variable bounce to warrant the 'poor' rating.

The pitch, which had initially received three demerit points, will now get only one demerit point. The ICC match referee however gave 'very good' rating to the Wankhede Stadium and Dr. YS Rajasekhara Reddy ACA-VDCA Cricket Stadium, Visakhapatnam pitches, where the first two ODIs between India and Australia were played.

Afghanistan thump Pakistan to claim T20I series

Afghanistan overcame late nerves in the closing overs to beat Pakistan by seven wickets in the second T20I on Sunday and take an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-game series.

Needing 30 off the last three overs, and 22 from the last two, Najibullah Zadran and Mohammad Nabi hit a six each off pace bowler Naseem Shah in the penultimate over to reduce the target to five runs.

Zadran then hit the winning boundary off Zaman Khan's last over to chase down the 131-run target with one ball to spare.

"It's a great honour and pleasure to lead this wonderful

team," said Afghanistan skipper Rashid Khan.

"It was a great effort with the ball, and then we took it deep and finished it."

He added: "I think 130 was a good total. We tried our best to take it deep and finish it. Our strategy was to go out there and make sure you take responsibility. We have players to finish it like Nabi and Najib."

Pakistan's 130-6 in 20 overs was built around a sedate 57-ball 64 not out by all-rounder Imad Wasim — his maiden T20I half century.

This was Afghanistan's first bilateral T20I series against any of the top six teams — India, England, Pakistan, South Africa, New Zealand and Australia.



They have previously won a T20I series each against the West Indies and Bangladesh and five in five against Zimbabwe.

Rahmanullah Gurbaz (44 off 49 balls) and Ibrahim Zadran (38 off 40 balls) set the platform during their 56-run

second wicket stand.

However, their slow batting left Afghanistan needing to score 46 off the last 30 balls.

Najibullah (23) and Nabi (14) remained unbeaten to seal the victory.

WPL 2023 ends with promise of changing Indian cricket for better

The Women's Premier League made a captivating debut and promised a bright future for the aspiring female cricketers in India but the hurriedly organised first season also left a lot of scope for improvement going forward.

The WPL, played entirely across two venues in Mumbai, witnessed special performances from some of the best cricketers in the world but leaving aside left-arm spinner Saika Ishaque, did not unearth a plethora of local talent like it was expected to.

The five-team competition culminated on Sunday with Mumbai Indians captain Harmanpreet Kaur finally leading her side across the line in the summit clash against a team captained by Australian legend Meg Lanning.

The tournament began with plenty of scores over 200 with boundaries as short as 42-44 metres, but pitches tired out eventually and became spin-friendly.

Mumbai's Hayley Matthews won the Purple Cap for her 16 wickets — including four in the final — but Nat Sciver-Brunt was the overall top performer with 10 wickets and 332 runs.

Apart from Mumbai Indians' Ishaque, who took 15 wickets, Shreyanka Patil and Kanika Ahuja of Royal Challengers Bangalore made their mark on the big stage but there was a clear gap between those from the Indian domestic circuit and the world's best.

While Patil lit up the field with her energy and enthusiasm, 20-year-old Ahuja showed tremendous promise at a young age with her explosive batting.

Harmanpreet acknowledged that little-known Indian players did not get many roles and opportunities to play, but added value to their teams with their fielding, citing the examples of MI's Amanjot Kaur and Jintamani Kalita.

The Indian skipper hoped that young and uncapped Indian players would emerge wiser from the experience, knowing what they need to do in order to bridge the gap.

Delhi's head coach Jonathan Batty left with the message, challenging young Indian players to work on their game and fitness for season two.

While Mumbai Indians achieved the high of recording five consecutive wins en route to the title triumph, a team led by another Indian star, Smriti Mandhana's Royal Challengers Bangalore, endured a five-game losing streak when the competition got underway and the tournament ended for them even before it began.

Mandhana admitted facing difficulties handling a team full of players with bigger stature and more experience than her.

Her own form with the bat failed to inspire RCB, who also had the likes of Ellyse Perry, Heather Knight, Sophie Devine, Megan Schutt and Renuka Singh to name a few.

No doubt Mandhana, a leadership prospect with the Indian team, will emerge better from her first WPL stint as captain and player but it remains to be seen how the team responds after a horrendous first season.

Lanning's Delhi Capitals did not instill fear in the opposition as Harmanpreet's MI did but the Australian Lanning led from the front and ended as the tournament's leading run-getter.

But if Lanning was consistent with the bat at the top, Shafali Verma blowing hot and cold remained an issue which Delhi Capitals could not do much about.

If RCB had to bear with Mandhana's poor run with the bat, Delhi Capitals experienced the same with their vice-captain Jemimah Rodrigues. The right-handed batter failed to score even a fifty, but entertained the crowd with her athleticism in the field taking some stunning catches.

Gujarat Giants began with losing their preferred captain Beth Mooney halfway into the first game and endured a largely disappointing campaign, but Deol's contributions mixed with Ashleigh Gardner's prowess give them hope for the future.

Sneh Rana did her best as stand-in captain, but overall, GG were not good enough to advance to the knockouts.

Alyssa Healy's UP Warriors got outplayed in the Eliminator by Mumbai Indians, but they were the first side to beat the eventual winners and showed a lot of promise with Navgire, Grace Harris, Anjali Sarvani and Sophie Ecclestone — who took joint highest 16 wickets — in their ranks.

The 22-game competition spread over as many days this March was held entirely in Mumbai, and like many, both Healy and Ecclestone also wished for home and away games from next season onwards.

It remains to be seen if the BCCI decides to organise the next WPL in the home-away format like the Indian Premier League, as crowd support plays a big part in the success of teams and also helps in creating a much needed fan base.
