Shah promises jobs, compensation for riot victims, deployment of more forces in Manipur

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday visited Churachandpur, the scene of some of the worst rioting in the recent ethnic conflict which broke out in Manipur earlier this month, and held talks with Kuki civil society leaders. He also held a series of discussions with different Meitei groups, women groups and prominent personalities earlier during the day in Imphal before flying to the headquarters of the hill district by the same name.

Among others, Shah who was accompanied by Intelligence Bureau (IB) chief and Union Home Secretary, met political and social leaders from the Kuki community to understand their grievances and find ways to bring peace to the northeastern state, which has witnessed a series of clashes between Meiteis and Kukis.

He held three rounds of talks with various groups such as Indigenous Tribal Leaders' Forum (ITLF), Kuki Students' Organisation (KSO) and other civil society organisations. He also met five Kuki MLAs from the BJP.

"We demanded total separation from Manipur — both political and geographical. We also sought President's Rule as the law and order has totally collapsed in the State," ITLF secretary Muan Tombing told PTI. The Home Minister on his part, requested the Kuki soci-

ety to maintain peace for the "next 15 days" with an assurance of sending more security personnel for the safety of common people, he added. Asked why Shah mentioned only "15 days", Tombing said, "He told us that the CBI will be entrusted with carrying out a detailed probe to find out the reasons behind this prolonged clash. Besides, a judicial enquiry will also be announced."

Earlier in the day, the Government announced it will provide a compensation of Rs 10 lakh to the next of kin of those who died in the ethnic conflict and a job to a family member. The compensation amount will be borne equally by the Centre and the State, an official release said. The decision was taken at a meeting between the Union Home minister and Chief Minister N Biren Singh in the presence of the Council of Ministers on Monday night.

Let SC judge-led panel probe riots: Cong to Prez

Top Congress leaders on Tuesday met President Droupadi Murmu and sought her intervention in helping bring normalcy in violence-hit Manipur, and called for the constitution of a high-level enquiry commission headed by a serving or retired Supreme Court judge to probe the incident.

A delegation of Congress leaders led by party Chief Mallikarjun Kharge met the President and handed over a memorandum to her seeking her urgent intervention and handed over a 12-point charter of demands to be taken immediately to help bring peace and normalcy in the



north-eastern State. "Though there were several lapses in the management of the situation at the early stages of violence, leading to the present imbroglio.

Now it is not the time to point fingers, but to act. If the suggestions above are implemented in earnest, peace can perhaps be restored once again.

CDS: Challenges in Manipur have not disappeared

In the backdrop of tension prevailing in Manipur, Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) General Anil Chauhan on Tuesday said challenges in the State have not disappeared, but expressed hope that things will settle down in some time. He also noted that the situation in the north-eastern State now is not related to insurgency.

These observations by him came as the death toll due to ethnic clashes in Manipur which began on May 3 went up to 80 and Home Minister Amit Shah who is now on a visit to the State held talks with various groups.

The CDS was in Pune on Tuesday to review the passing out parade of 144th course of National Defence Academy (NDA). Asked about situation in Manipur, he told reporters that, "The Army, Assam Rifles were deployed in Manipur before 2020. Since the challenges of northern borders were far more, we were able to withdraw Army. Since insurgency situation had normalised, we were able to do that."

The situation now in Manipur is "not related to insurgency". It is a clash between two ethnicities and a situation of law and order, he said. "We are helping the State Government with the problem," the CDS said.

UWW hits out at detention of grapplers, threatens WFI ban

Khap, farmer leaders convince wrestlers not to immerse medals in Ganga river

On a drama-filled Tuesday, some of India's best wrestlers accompanied by hundreds of supporters gathered on the banks of the Ganga, threatening to immerse their World and Olympic medals in the holy river but refrained after being convinced by Khap and farmer leaders who sought five days to address their grievances.

Meanwhile, in evidence of growing support to the grapplers the global governing body for wrestling, United World Wrestling (UWW), issued a statement on the grapplers' protest, saying that events of these last days are even more worrying," and the legendary Anil Kumble on Tuesday said he is "dismayed" by the treatment meted out to the protesting wrestlers at Jantar Mantar where they were manhandled and detained by police for trying to march towards the new Parliament building and hold a 'Mahila Mahapanchayat'.

Earlier, Olympic champion shooter Abhinav Bindra, Indian football captain Sunil Chhetri and former India all-



rounder Irfan Pathan too had expressed solidarity with the grapplers. On a day that India's top wrestlers like Rio 2016 bronze medalist Sakshi Malik, Tokyo 2020 medalist Bajrang Punia and world championship medalist Vinesh Phogat almost immersed their medals in the Ganga river, the UWW, came out with a strong statement condemning the "treatment and detention of the wrestlers".

"For several months, United World Wrestling has followed with great concern the situation in India where wrestlers are protesting over allegations of abuse and harassment by the President of the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI)," the statement said before adding: "UWW will request further information about the next elective general assembly from the IOA and the Ad-hoc Committee of the WFI."

The 45-day deadline that was initially set to hold this elective assembly shall be respected. Failing to do so may lead UWW to suspend the federation, thereby forcing

the athletes to compete under a neutral flag. It is reminded that UWW 'already took a measure in this situation by reallocating the Asian Championship planned in New Delhi earlier this year.'

SKM calls for June 1 nationwide dharna in support of grapplers

New Delhi: Farmers' outfit Samyukta Kisan Morcha on Tuesday called for nationwide demonstrations on June 1 in support of wrestlers who have been demanding the arrest of BJP MP and WFI chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, accused of sexually harassing women grapplers.

The Samyukta Kisan Morcha, in a statement, said it has given the call for the nationwide agitation "to secure democratic right to protest by the Indian wrestlers" and all other sections of society and to "demand the arrest of Brij Bhushan Saran Singh". **PTI**

Delhi girl's killer bought knife 15 days ago: Police

The 20-year-old AC mechanic arrested for his involvement in the horrific Shahbad Dairy murder case purchased the knife used in the killing of 16-year-old girl from Haridwar in Uttarakhand around 15 days ago, said the Delhi Police which is probing the case. Police said on Tuesday that they are yet to recover the knife, adding that Sahil dumped it near Rithala Metro Station after the killing on Sunday evening.

The accused had planned the murder two days ago after the girl rebuffed him in front of her friends and refused to mend her relationship with him, said police. "Since Sahil bought the knife days before the incident, it is not unlikely he was planning to kill her already, yet he is claiming he killed the girl in a fit of rage for her constantly ignoring him, they said. "The statements made by him are being verified since it is the initial stage of investigation. Sometimes he



says she ignored him as he tried to approach her, which angered him. But he also suspected her getting involved with her former boyfriend," the police said.

Earlier, Sahil was produced at Delhi's Rohini court on Tuesday and was sent to police remand for two days.

Police said they will be recreating the scene of crime and will also check Sahil's mobile phone and social media accounts to know whether he was in touch with other girls.

In a related development, the National Commission for Scheduled Castes has sought a report from the Delhi Government and the city police over the horrific killing of a teenage girl in the north-west part of the national Capital.

Politicos of all hues line up at victim's house, offer solace, compensation

Political parties from the spectrum — the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), the BJP and the Congress — jostled to seek mileage from the gruesome stabbing case by queuing up at the Shahbad Dairy area to meet with the victim's family members and even making announcements of compensation.

The leaders from BJP, AAP, and Congress met and condoled with the bereaved family members of the 16-year-old girl who was killed in broad daylight in the Shahbad Dairy area of north-west Delhi. Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday announced an ex gratia of Rs 10 lakh to her kin to help them tide over the tragedy while Delhi Women and Child Welfare Minister Atishi met the girl's family members and assured that the Government would ensure that the accused receives the harshest of punishment.

BJP MP Hans Raj Hans also met the girl's family on Tuesday morning and said no amount of money can bring the family its daughter back and also condemned the AAP for "politicising" the murder and using it to score political brownie points.

Delhi Congress president Anil Chaudhary, who also visited the family members of the victim, said, "Blame game begins" between Kejriwal and the L-G every time the "Government is held accountable." Delhi Commission for Women (DCW) Swati Maliwal too met the girl's family. The girl was stabbed over 20 times and bludgeoned to death by a youth in a busy bylane of Shahbad Dairy area as passers-by looked on in fear and disbelief. "The Delhi Government will provide an ex-gratia of Rs 10 lakh to the family of the victim and will try its best to get the culprit punished severely by the court. Best lawyers will be fielded for this case," Kejriwal in a tweet in Hindi announced.

Atishi visited the family of the victim in the Shahabad Dairy murder case and offered her condolences.

10 Vaishno pilgrims dead, 66 hurt as bus falls off bridge

Ten Vaishno Devi pilgrims were killed and 66 injured on Tuesday as the bus they were travelling in veered off the road while crossing a bridge near Jhajjar Kotli along the Jammu Srinagar National Highway. The death toll may go up as Government Medical College Hospital Principal Shashi Soodan said two of the injured admitted at the facility are critical.

The officials said the bus, which was on its way to Katra from Amritsar, met with the accident in the Jhajjar Kotli area on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway between 6.30 and 7 am. Katra is a base camp for the pilgrims visiting the famous shrine atop the Trikuta hills in Reasi district.

They said most of the travellers were members of an extended family from Bihar's Lakhisarai and were on pilgrimage to Vaishno Devi temple for a ritual of a child.

"The accident took place at Jhajjar Kotli bridge. Ten people have died. Rescue operation is almost complete," Jammu Senior Superintendent of Police

Chandan Kohli told PTI. "We are investigating the reasons behind the accident."

Local residents, CRPF and police personnel rushed to the spot and launched the rescue operation.

"The troops of 137 CRPF battalion carried out the rescue operation to evacuate injured driver and passengers from the bus, which turned turtle and fell down from Jhajjar Kotli bridge on highway," the force said in a tweet.

"Two persons were

brought dead while others died on the spot," said GMC hospital principal Soodan.

Jammu and Kashmir DGP Dilbagh Singh said prima facie the cause of accident appeared to be human error or over speeding.

It is possible that the driver might have dozed off on the wheel. It's a high flyover kind of road from where the bus fell off, so the reason could also be overspeeding. It is part of our investigation," he told reporters.

India's Def exports up 23 times at ₹16K-cr

With the Government giving a push to self-reliance in defence sector, India's defence exports jumped 23 times and have reached an all-time high, surging from Rs. 686 crore in Financial Year(FN) 2013- 14 to nearly Rs 16,000 crore in FY 2022-23. Giving these details here, a Government statement said on Tuesday this remarkable 23-fold increase reflects India's progress in the global defence manufacturing sector. With exports reaching more than 85 countries, India's defence industry has shown its capability of design and development to the

world, with 100 firms exporting defence products at present.

To give a push to defence exports, the Government has taken a number of policy initiatives and brought reforms over the last 9 years. Export procedures have been simplified and made industry-friendly with end-to-end online export authorisation curtailing delays and bringing ease of doing business.

The Atmanirbhar Bharat initiatives have helped the country by encouraging indigenous design, development and manufacture of defence equipment in the country, thereby reducing dependency on imports in the long run.

New Delhi: A male passenger onboard an Air India (A-I) flight from Goa on Monday physically assaulted a crew member and was handed over to the security personnel after landing at the Delhi airport, according to the airline.

In recent months, there have been multiple incidents of unruly passenger behaviour onboard aircraft and the latest incident happened onboard flight AI882 enroute from Goa to Delhi. "The said passenger verbally abused the crew members and then went on to physically assault one of them on board.

Purana Qila reveals more of its historic past

Layers of history peeled as archeologists unearth ancient copper wheel, bone needle, kiln and coins

Historical Purana Qila in the National Capital continues to enthrall archeologists who recently unearthed a range of ancient artifacts such as a spoked copper wheel of Kushana era, an arrowhead of the Rajput period and coins dating from the Mughal reign from the site.

India now plans to showcase this treasure trove of its rich heritage and cultural diversity to foreign delegates during the forthcoming G20 Summit to be held here in September. The fresh round of excavation

which began in late January is being led by archaeologist Vasant Swarnkar. This is the third round of excavations at the 16th Century Purana Qila, after excavations in 2013-14 and 2017-18 revealed nine cul-

tural levels, representing different historical periods, including the pre-Mauryan period, Mauryan, Sunga, Kushana, Gupta, post-Gupta, Rajput, Sultanate, and Mughal period. It is one of "rare archae-

ological sites" in India where layers of history spanning over 2,500 years have been found, Swarnkar said, adding that painted grey wares (PGWs) were found in the first round of excavations in 2013-14.

Union Minister G Kishan Reddy who visited the site on Tuesday morning said, "This is the only site in Delhi-NCR where one can witness the continuous history of Delhi from the pre-Mauryan to Mughal period through the excavated remains. The findings showcase the rich cultural heritage of our country." The ongoing excavation, initiated in January 2023, aims to

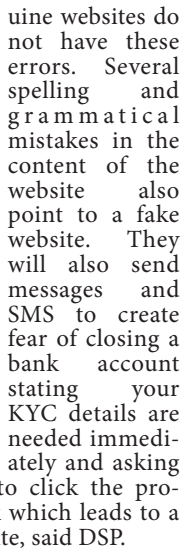
establish a complete chronology of site. Currently, structures from the early Kushana level have been exposed, with a depth of 5.50 meters reached thus far. This excavation is expected to provide further insights into the ancient city of Indraprastha.

The excavation has yielded a remarkable collection of artifacts. Notable findings include a stone image of Vaikuntha Vishnu, a terracotta plaque of Gaja Laxmi, a stone image of Ganesha, seals and sealings, coins, terracotta figurines of humans and animals, beads of various stones, TC, and a bone needle.

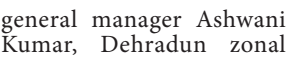

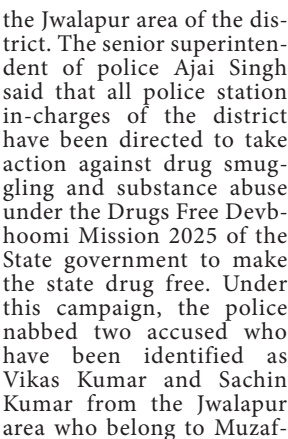

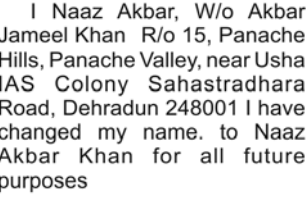

Authorities to collect over Rs 40 lakh challan from 124 BWGs and vantonment board

In view of the violations of Solid Waste Management rules, a total of 124 Bulk Waste Generators (BWGs) will pay a recovery challan (RC) amounting to Rs 21.56 lakh to the Municipal Corporation of Dehradun (MCD). The corporation had initially issued notices to these establishments last month most of which include apartment buildings and housing societies for not disposing of their bulk waste as per the rules and not responding to the health section regarding their disposal plan despite multiple attempts, said the chief municipal health officer Dr Avinash Khanna. He said that MCD issued notices to 116 BWGs, most of which include apartment buildings, housing societies and some eateries, stating that they must approach the corporation with their plan to dispose of the bulk waste generated in their respective premises within the stipulated time and submit a fine of Rs 10,000. "We had also warned via notices that if they will not comply with rules, MCD will take action legal action against them. Still, many of these establishments did not take these warnings seriously but the corporation approached the collectorate which will now collect RC from such establishments," said Khanna. He said that the corporation has also imposed a penalty of Rs one lakh each on eight housing societies for not disposing of their bulk waste through door to door garbage collection vehicles. They had allegedly refused to dispose of their waste through MCD's vehicles as they prefer private rickshaws for waste disposal. Khanna said that since RC is collected by the Collectorate office, they also recover 10 per cent of the challan from offenders as collection fees as per the rules. "Due to this, a person who was asked to submit a fine of Rs 10,000 or Rs one lakh to MCD will now have to submit a total of Rs 11,000 and Rs 1.10 lakh," said Khanna. He also said that MCD had also imposed a fine of Rs 20 lakh on Clement Town Cantonment Board for allegedly dumping garbage illegally in its garbage transfer station at Kargi Chowk in September last year which will also be collected as RC in addition



to Rs 20,000. Besides this, the corporation had also imposed a penalty of Rs 10

lakh on two residential societies in Sahastradhara Road who were allegedly

disposing of their sewer waste on drains and will now have to pay it as RC too with extra charges. He said that if these establishments fail to pay RC by May 31, authorities can even arrest them as per the protocols. He said that MCD has started sending notices to other BWGs and violators too who do not take the importance of maintaining sanitation in the city seriously.

Health department to have separate cadre of specialist doctors

The State administration has started the process to create a separate cadre for the specialist doctors in the State health department. A proposal in this regard would be brought up in the meeting of the State cabinet soon. Presiding over a review meeting of the health department on Tuesday, the health minister Dhan Singh Rawat said that in view of shortage of specialist doctors a separate cadre for specialist doctors would be created and their retirement age would be increased to 65 years.

He directed that for better operation of the schemes under the National Health Mission (NHM), 883 posts vacant at various levels should be filled. Posts of medical officers, staff nurses, lab technicians, specialist doctors, Ayush Medical officers, pharmacists, counsellors, social workers, midwifery and educators are vacant in NHM. The minister added that family members of the deceased employees would be appointed on compassionate



grounds. He also directed the officers to start the process of departmental promotions on the vacant posts. The minister expressed his displeasure at the slow pace of expenditure in the budget allotted for NHM. Out of the allotted budget of Rs 831.38 lakhs for NHM during the year 2022-23 only Rs 460.40 lakh could be spent. The minister directed that a detailed working plan should be prepared for 100 per cent usage of the available budget of NHM. The health secretary Deependra Chaudhary. Additional secretary Arunendra Singh Chauhan, Amandeep Kaur, director general health (DG) health Dr Vinita Shah and others were present on the occasion.

Police find deformed skeleton of infant allegedly killed by father

Haridwar police on Tuesday found a deformed skeleton of a female infant who was allegedly killed by her father, said the senior superintendent of police Ajai Singh. He said that the accused named Rashid was taken into custody on various charges including forcing a woman to marry him, allegedly forcing her into unnatural sex, domestic violence and demanding dowry among others. He said that Rashid was also accused of killing his infant daughter soon after her



birth. He said that Haridwar district's Laksar police got these complaints against the

accused on May 19 and arrested him the next day. He was sent to the district jail on judicial custody remand after being presented in the court. He claimed that as per the information provided by Rashid during the remand, the police recovered a deformed skeleton of a three-day old female child from the Sultampur cemetery. The infant

was allegedly killed by him. He said that the legal process was carried out in the presence of Nayab Tehsildar. The police have sent the remains for postmortem and a DNA test will also be conducted to gather strong evidence in the case against the culprit, said Singh. He said that the accused Rashid was sent back to jail after carrying out necessary medical tests as per the rules. The police will take further action against him on the basis of evidence and test reports, added SSP.

The US has accorded a “depth” of friendship and strategic partnership to India that is unmatched in the world and it is set to expand further during Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s visit to Washington next month, US Ambassador Eric Garcetti said on Tuesday.

In an interview to PTI, Garcetti suggested that the two countries are working on certain agreements to bolster defence cooperation and they are likely to be firmed up when Modi visits the US or President Joe Biden comes to India in September for the G20 summit.

On challenges being faced by India from China along its land border as well as in the maritime domain, he said New Delhi can depend on Washington as it stands for respecting borders, sovereignty and the rule of law.

“We will protect and



defend these principles. If one country thinks that it can unilaterally change the status quo, that is unacceptable to all of us. We also want to deter action. We would like to see a more peaceful relationship with China for both India and the United States,” he said.

At the same time, Garcetti asserted that “bullying” by anybody would not be acceptable.

He said India-US partnership has assumed greater significance for the world in the context of the current geopolitical situation, asserting that the partnership is not only beneficial for the two countries but also for the globe.

India, Cambodia discuss capacity building, defence

Today that is expressed in cooperation in heritage conservation, demining, water conservation and socio-economic projects.”

Discussions between Dhankhar and the Cambodian King “covered multiple areas of bilateral relations, including

capacity building, conservation of architectural monuments, defence cooperation, including de-mining, parliamentary cooperation,” MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said. In a separate tweet, the Vice President Secretariat said Dhankhar recalled the warm welcome and good discussions during his visit to Cambodia for India-ASEAN and East Asia Summits in 2022.

“They had wide-ranging discussions on bilateral relations and other issues of mutual interest,” it said.

The visiting dignitary on Tuesday morning paid tributes to Mahatma Gandhi at Raj Ghat. The Cambodian King arrived here on Monday on a maiden state visit. He is accompanied by a 27-member high-level delegation, including the minister of the royal palace, minister of foreign affairs and other senior officials.

The state visit marks the culmination of the celebrations of the 70th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and Cambodia.

India to host SCO annual meet virtually

India will host the annual summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) in the virtual format on July 4. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) announced this on Tuesday but it did not cite reasons for holding the summit in virtual mode.

Last year, the in-person SCO summit took place in the Uzbek city of Samarkand that was attended by all top leaders of the grouping including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Russian President Vladimir Putin and his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping.

India assumed the rotating chairmanship of the SCO at the Samarkand Summit on September 16 last year.

“Under India’s first-ever chairmanship, the 22nd sum-

mit of the SCO Council of Heads of State will be held in the virtual format on July 4, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi,” the MEA said in a statement. India hosted the foreign ministers of the SCO at a two-day conclave in Goa earlier this month. All the SCO member states — China, Russia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan — have been invited to attend the summit, the MEA said.

“In addition, Iran, Belarus and Mongolia have been invited as observer states. As per SCO tradition, Turkmenistan has also been invited as the guest of the chair,” it said.

The SCO is an influential economic and security bloc and has emerged as one of the largest trans-regional international organisations.

India major player in world, says UN peacekeeping chief

We’re also supported in many other ways, including in terms of the initiatives that we take to improve peacekeeping,” Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations Jean-Pierre Lacroix told PTI in an exclusive interview.

The UN peacekeeping

chief highlighted the “important role” played by peacekeepers from India, one of the significant troop and police-contributing countries to UN peacekeeping.

Lacroix said India’s “engagement and commitment” in support of peace operations is critical, both politically through its contribution and in support of the department’s initiatives.

He further underlined the “role of India in supporting our initiative to make sure that peace operations will be up to speed in terms of digital technologies because this is absolutely critical. We have a strategy for the digital transformation of peacekeeping.”

The UN marked 75 years of peacekeeping and commemorated the International Day of UN Peacekeepers on May 29 with this year’s theme of “Peace begins with me”.

Three Indian peacekeepers, who lost their lives serving under the UN flag last year, were honoured posthumously with the prestigious Dag Hammarskjöld Medal at a solemn ceremony last week.

ED raids locations in probe against J'Khand MLA case

The Enforcement Directorate on Tuesday conducted searches at various locations in Jharkhand linked to Congress MLA Pradeep Yadav and others as part of a money laundering probe.

The five-term legislator from the Poraiyahat seat of the State is presently the deputy leader of the party in the State Assembly. Sources said about a dozen locations linked to the MLA in the State were searched as part of a probe being conducted against him and others under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

In 2022, the Income Tax Department had searched the premises of Yadav, and another party legislator as part of a tax evasion probe against some business groups engaged in coal trading and other illegal trading activities in Jharkhand.

Ludhiana court blast case: Supplementary chargesheet filed

The NIA has filed a supplementary chargesheet against two persons in the Ludhiana court complex bomb blast case, in which one person was killed and six others injured on December 23, 2021.

One of the chargesheeted accused, Lakhbir Singh alias Rode of Moga district of Punjab, is reportedly in Pakistan from where he had smuggled IEDs into India for triggering explosions across Punjab. He is Chief of banned outfits, Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF) and International Sikh Youth Federation (ISFY).

The other accused chargesheeted in the case on Tuesday, Harpreet Singh alias Happy Malaysia of Amritsar district, was arrested in December 2022 from the Indian Gandhi International Airport (IGIA), Delhi.

One can’t malign judicial officers by using social media, says SC

One cannot malign judicial officers by using Social Media, the Supreme Court observed on Tuesday while dismissing a plea challenging a Madhya Pradesh High Court order that sentenced a man to 10 days in jail for making corruption allegations against a District Judge. A conviction bench of Justice Bela M Trivedi and Justice Prashant Kumar Mishra said it was not inclined to interfere in the matter.

“Just because you don’t get a favourable order doesn’t mean that you will malign the judicial officer. Independence

of (the) judiciary doesn’t just mean independence from (the) executive but also from outside forces. This has to be a lesson for others also.

“He should have thought twice before casting any aspersions on the judicial officer. He maligning the judicial officer. Think of the damage done to the judicial officer’s image,” Justice Trivedi observed orally. The apex court was hearing a plea filed by Krishna Kumar Raghuvanshi, challenging the High Court judgment in a suo motu criminal contempt case initiated against him for making allegations of corruption against a District Judge.

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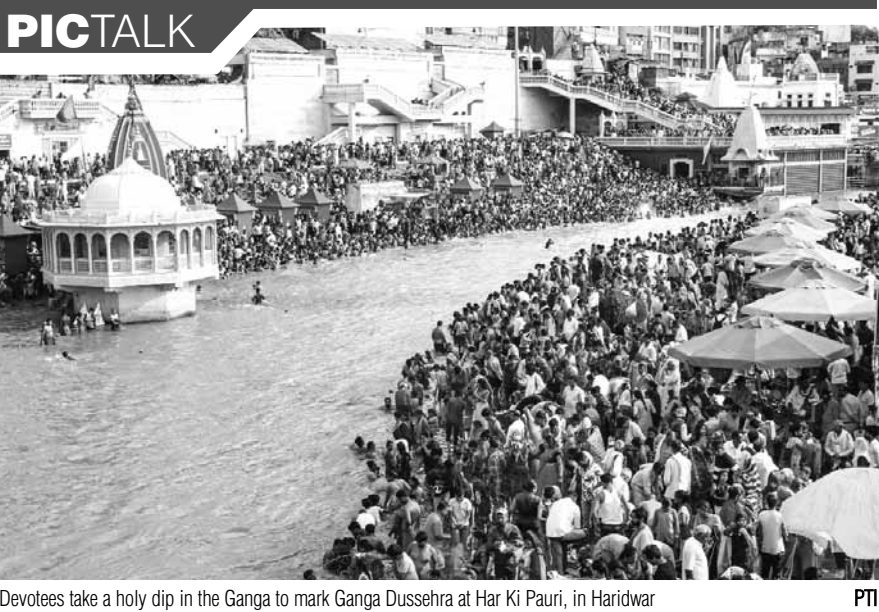
Confident Congress

The party hopes to reconcile the differences between Gehlot and Pilot

Victory, John F Kennedy said, has a thousand fathers. All of them nourish it further, making it grow strong, resilient and confident. The landslide mandate that the Congress received in the recently-concluded Assembly election in Karnataka seems to have galvanised the grand old party in more than one way. It has certainly broken the toxic mix of sloth and inertia on fratricide in Rajasthan. On Monday, the high command summoned Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and his political rival and former deputy Sachin Pilot to Delhi. The duo had four-hour-long discussions with Rahul Gandhi and party president Mallikarjun Kharge. "Both leaders have unanimously decided to work together and left the decision on the high command," senior party leader KC Venugopal reportedly said after the meeting without divulging any details. On the face of it, this was an anodyne statement, but GOP leaders must have heaved a sigh of relief that the two desert warriors sat together after a long time. This is important as the Assembly election in Rajasthan is due later this year, especially as the State is known for changing government every five years. As it is, the no-holds-barred fight between Gehlot and Pilot has hurt the party's image in the State. Some time ago, the party may have feared a repeat of Rajasthan in Karnataka. Now, having reconciled the differences between Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and State party chief DK Shivakumar, the GOP would like to do a Karnataka in Rajasthan.



It may not be easy, though, for the Congress. The fight between Gehlot and Pilot was quite intense in which many red lines were crossed. Gehlot had made several uncharitable remarks about Pilot. Pilot, on his part, had been denouncing the Gehlot Government over inaction on alleged corruption during the previous BJP government under Vasundhara Raje. The big question is: would Gehlot and Pilot be willing to bury the hatchet? It is not just the GOP leadership but the entire Opposition would like them to, for if that happens, not only the Congress would be in a stronger position to take on the Bharatiya Janata Party in the forthcoming State polls but also in the 2024 general election. Further, as an upshot, the entire Opposition would gain strength. Many Opposition leaders are trying to forge an alliance against the Bharatiya Janata Party. Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar will be holding a meeting in Patna in a few days; Nationalist Congress Party leader Sharad Pawar is working towards that end. All these attempts, along with the Congress' newfound confidence, can make arithmetic favourable for the Opposition, but that may not be enough. As we mentioned earlier, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is not the BJP's solitary trump card; the saffron party has also been able to entrench its narrative in political debate—the narrative of muscular nationalism, Hindutva, and unprecedented infrastructure development. The Opposition doesn't have a viable alternative to that.

Indo-Nepal ties will flourish on trust

Political engagement between the countries is missing for some time now. The historicity of bilateral relations will depend on Prachanda's longevity as PM

PM Pushpa Kamal Dahal Prachanda will finally arrive today on a four days visit. Prachanda's first visit was a state visit when he came after the 10 April 2008 Constituent Assembly elections to 575 elected seats (out of 601) after the monarchy was dismantled and Nepal declared a federal democratic, secular republic. Prachanda who won peace after ten years of civil war, became Nepal's charismatic leader and beloved hero, his party winning 227 seats more than Nepali Congress (110) and CPN UML (103) combined.

It was a rude shock for India which had put its money on Nepali Congress. Still, it tried to adjust to Maoist ways to give Prachanda a grand welcome with the expectation that he would be sensitive to India's concerns and national interests. That hope was belied as Prachanda had ideas of a People's Republic chasing which he was forced to resign. The rest is a legend. In the second CA elections in November 2013, Maoists won 81 seats. Prachanda's second visit was in 2016-17 when he switched to NC from UML for power-sharing with NC PM Sher Bahadur Deuba. After the 2017 elections, Maoists won 53 seats and were forced to join the Left alliance which won a nearly two-thirds majority but Prachanda's hopes of becoming Prime Minister in a power-sharing deal with PM KP Oli never materialised.

In November 2022 elections his party slumped to 32 seats but all through the electoral cycles, CPN (Maoist Centre) even with declining numbers, remained the number 3 party – the kingmakers – with NC and UML alternating as the single largest party. Prachanda's reduced strength and power had not dimmed his ambition to be the prime minister. He demonstrated political dexterity in switching coalitions earlier this year to remain PM. Nepal's mixed electoral system makes a single-party majority unlikely. People

frustrated with the non-performance of older parties, voted TV anchor, Rabi Lamichhane, as leader of the fourth largest Rashtriya Swatantra Party (22



seats) and the rapper Balen Shah, Mayor of Kathmandu humbling NC, UML and Maoists.

The three by-polls held in April in which RSP won two seats with overwhelming numbers including one from an NC stronghold have rung alarm bells for all political parties. Prachanda wants to revive the fortune of Maoists with India's help. That is why Prachanda wants to make his present visit historic and a game changer in India-Nepal relations for which he has to win back India's trust and most of all, the trust of the people of Nepal. He is now part of the eight-party coalition led by NC, along with CPN (Unified Socialist), Janata Samajwadi Party, Loktantrik Samajwadi Party, Janmat Party, Nagarik Unmukti Party and Rashtriya Jan Morcha. It is a different Prachanda who as Prime Minister leads the coalition and his party. He has to undo the pro-China image that he shed long ago that went unnoticed by New Delhi's political elite. This will not be easy in a Left-Right coalition.

Prachanda has to remould his party with a makeover of leadership. India should be impressed that Prachanda unlike in 2008 when he went to China first, has this time declined Beijing's invitation for the Boao Forum in March and declared his intention to

visit India first despite the scheduling and cabinet formation difficulties. New Delhi has not sent the right signals by failing to give an earlier date for his visit. It would have added to the credibility and stability of the coalition government. During the last Prime Ministerial visit of Mr Deuba last year, no major agreements were signed. Wait, watch and act after the November 2022 elections were India's policy. Mr Dahal has proved his nimbleness by securing three votes of confidence, signing two Common Minimum Programmes and getting the budget passed last Monday. He is also seen to be acting against corruption.

One of the key expectations of Nepal is a more fair and liberal power trade agreement. At a power summit held in Kathmandu in April, Nepalese power traders complained that India had not provided full access to power markets as per the MoU of 2014. New Delhi has so far permitted the sale of 452.6 MW whereas Kathmandu wants to sell 1000MW of power. There are other restrictions to the sale of power especially from projects with any connection with Chinese companies or Chinese contractors. Besides trade with India, it wants to diversify – sell to Bangladesh also. Connectivity

is the other big expectation. The DPR of the 136 km Raxaul-Kathmandu railway project spurred by an earlier Chinese proposal of a Railway from Kirung to Kathmandu has to be progressed. It is estimated to cost USD 2.5bn for which Nepal wants a grant. Nepal is also interested in India setting up a fertilizer plant and/or a pipeline similar to the petroleum pipeline from Birgunj to Amlekhgunj. The Pokhara international airport built by the Chinese with a China Eximbank loan remains confined to domestic use because of Indian reservations. Another issue that may come up is Agniveer due to which Gorkha's recruitment from Nepal is in suspended animation. Overall 12 MOUs are to be signed which is historic.

Political engagement between leaders missing for some time now requires restoration. The historicity of bilateral relations will depend on the stability of the coalition and Prachanda's longevity as PM. In some ways they are interdependent.

Innovative ways to beat the smoking urge

Owing to increasing consumption of tobacco across the world, the WHO dedicated May 31 to commemorate 'World No-Tobacco Day' in 1987

Consumption of tobacco is injurious to health. Everyone around is aware of this fact, however, for the majority of tobacco users, the allure of tobacco and the cravings it evokes can be overpowering. Owing to the increasing consumption of tobacco among individuals worldwide, WHO dedicated 31st May to commemorate World No-Tobacco Day every year since 1987. However, the urge to indulge in smoking is mostly irresistible to tobacco users and thereby to battle those urges, it is crucial to bear in mind that it will typically subside within 10 minutes, regardless of whether or not you succumb to the temptation. Let us explore some innovative and effective methods that can aid you in fending off the urge to smoke or utilize tobacco when cravings strike.

- **Embrace Nicotine Replacement Therapy:** This therapeutic approach encompasses various options, such as prescription of nicotine administered via nasal spray or inhaler, Over-the-counter nicotine patches, gum,



and lozenges, or prescription of non-nicotine cessation medications like bupropion (Wellbutrin SR, Wellbutrin XL, etc) and varenicline. These swift-acting treatments are generally safe to use alongside long-acting nicotine patches or non-nicotine cessation medications.

- **Steer Clear of Triggers** – One must be aware of the triggers that prompt one to smoke. It is most likely that the potency of tobacco urges gets most pronounced in settings where one habitually smokes or chews tobacco. For instance, parties, bars, moments of stress, or while savouring a cup of coffee are likely scenarios. Identify your triggers and devise a plan to avoid them.
- **Social networking:** The formation of social networks by persons who

have successfully quit smoking, and their motivation for persons in the process of quitting may help psychologically.

- **Employ the Power of Delay-** When struck by tobacco craving, challenge yourself to postpone its enchantment by an additional 10 minutes. During this time, engage in activities that successfully divert your attention. Consider venturing into a smoke-free zone within your vicinity. Employing these simple but effective tactics might be sufficient to surmount the craving.
- **Channel Your Chewing Impulses-** Offer your mouth an alternative activity to ward off tobacco cravings. Chew on sugarless gum or relish a piece of hard candy or else savour the crunch of raw carrots, nuts, or sunflower seeds for distraction.

Some people find success with nicotine replacement therapy, while others prefer to quit cold turkey. Several support groups can aid avid smokers in quitting. No matter which method you choose, it is important to be patient and persistent because quitting smoking is not easy; however, it is certainly worth it, for your health.

Children with disabilities need robust policies for support

The National Family Health Survey must include specific questions about disabilities to help formulate appropriate policy

INDIA HAS 2.68 CRORE PERSONS WITH A DISABILITY, ACCORDING TO THE 2011 CENSUS. HOWEVER, WITH THE RIGHTS OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES ACT, OF 2016, NOW RECOGNIZING 21 TYPES OF DISABILITIES, THIS NUMBER IS EXPECTED TO INCREASE MANIFOLD. A ROBUST POLICY IS CRITICAL TO ENCOMPASS THEIR ASPIRATIONS AND ENSURE ALL PERSONS WITH DISABILITY ACHIEVE THEIR FULL POTENTIAL AND PLAY AN ACTIVE PART IN NATION-BUILDING.

THIS IS WHY THE RECENT DECISION TO DROP QUESTIONS RELATED TO DISABILITY FROM THE SIXTH NATIONAL FAMILY HEALTH SURVEY (NFHS), SCHEDULED TO BEGIN ON JULY 1, 2023, IS INEXPLICABLE. THE NFHS, CONDUCTED EVERY THREE YEARS, COLLECTS DATA ON A GAMUT OF DEVELOPMENT INDICES VITAL TO INFORM POLICY AND PROGRAMMES.

This survey, which covers approximately seven lakh households across the country, is an important tool to gather data on whether people with disabilities have access to basic amenities and other government programmes.

However, at a time when the need to ensure no one gets left behind is doubly important considering the ravages caused by Covid, the exclusion of questions on disability is an opportunity lost to gather disaggregated disability data.

An Opportunity Lost

According to the Disability Rights India Foundation (DRIF), a non-profit working for disability rights, disability disaggregated data is the cornerstone for disability-relevant services. Instead of sharpening its questionnaire related to disability, NFHS has reversed the process by removing disability-related questions altogether.

Considering that India is a signatory to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), this regressive move contradicts its principle of "leaving no one behind" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. In India, PwDs experience an average loss of 10-17 years in life expectancy. Creating pathways to change this and make health services disability inclusive requires access to comprehensive health data which NFHS could have provided.

Children with disabilities are disadvantaged on most measures of child well-being. In comparison to children without disabilities, children with disabilities are 24% less likely to receive early stimulation and responsive care; 42% less likely to have never attended school; 32% more likely to face corporal punishment; 47% more likely to be out of primary school, 33% more likely to be out of lower secondary school and 27% more likely to be out of upper secondary school; 51% more likely to feel unhappy and 41% likely to feel more discriminated against.

Now consider the fact that one-third of disabilities in children are preventable if detected early and empowered with timely interventions. A roadmap based on accurate data to reach about 20.42 lakh children in the 0-9 age group with some form of disabilities, either congenital or acquired, could be life-changing.

It is no secret that existing disparities were exacerbated by Covid. In the context of education, data shows that before the pandemic, more than 4.1 million girls were not going to school across India. The closure of 1.5 million schools during the pandemic impacted over 247 million children enrolled in elementary and secondary schools, including 37 million with disabilities.

A 2020 survey by Swabhimana, a community-based organization working for the rights of persons with disability, in Odisha, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Tripura, Chennai, Sikkim, Nagaland, Haryana and J&K found about 43% of children with disabilities planned to drop out due to hardships in online education.

It is not just the lack of access to educational aids that impedes the well-being of a PwD. They have little or no access to health services as information about disease symptoms and prevention, is not provided in accessible formats such as print materials in Braille, sign language interpretation, captions, audio provisions and graphics.

Women with disabilities are doubly marginalised on account of their disability and their gender and face greater social barriers, discrimination and isolation. Moreover, women and girls with disabilities are three times more likely to experience gender-based violence compared to non-disabled women.

The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, emphasises prevention of disability through appropriate awareness measures, investigation, and research. Article 31 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities mandates collection of appropriate information on PwDs to enable the formulation and implementation of policies. Can there be a better mechanism than the NFHS to gather data to understand the prevalence and pattern of disabilities?

Khan appears before anti-terrorism court

Pakistan's former prime minister Imran Khan on Tuesday appeared before an anti-terrorism court in four cases, including the attack on Lahore Corp Commander House, and submitted surety bonds in connection with his pre-arrest bail till June 2.

"Khan appeared before the ATC Lahore judge Ijaz Ahmad Buttar and submitted surety bonds worth PKR 100,000 each in the four terrorism cases in which he had already been given pre-arrest bail till June 2," a court official told PTI.

As the 70-year-old chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party appeared in the court amid high security, a group of lawyers chanted slogans in his favour.

Khan's counsel also challenged the search warrants of the former premier's Zaman Park Lahore residence in the anti-terrorism court. The judge summoned the Punjab



police DIG (operations) for next hearing and directed him to submit a reply.

On May 9, violent protests erupted after the arrest of Khan by paramilitary Rangers in Islamabad. His party workers vandalised over 20 military installations and government buildings, including the Lahore Corps Commander House, Mianwali airbase and the ISI building in Faisalabad. The Army headquarters (GHQ) in Rawalpindi was also attacked by the mob for the first time. Khan was later released on bail.

Sharif: Anarchists don't qualify for dialogue

Islamabad (PTI): Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday hinted that his government was unwilling to talk with Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party, saying the "anarchists and arsonists" who wear the garb of politicians and attack the symbols of the state do not

Law enforcement agencies have arrested over 10,000 workers of Khan's Pakistan party across Pakistan, 4,000 of them from Punjab. Police put the death toll in violent clashes to 10 while Khan's party claims 40 of its workers lost their lives in the firing by security personnel.

Meanwhile, two lawyers of Khan appeared before a joint investigation team probing

JIT summons ex-Pak PM

Lahore (PTI): A joint investigation team probing the violent attack on the historic Corps Commander House or the Jinnah House here on May 9 has summoned former Pakistan prime minister Imran Khan on Tuesday. Khan, the chief of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party, has been asked to appear before the JIT at 4 pm at the Qilla Gujjar police headquarters in Lahore. He has been called for questioning in a case registered with the Sarwar Road police station against the attack. Jinnah House (Corps Commander House) was torched by arsonists following the anti-government protests against the arrest of Khan on May 9. A large number of PTI party workers May 9 stormed the Jinnah House and set it on fire after vandalising it.

No meeting between US, Chinese defence chiefs, says Beijing

Prospects for a renewed high-level military dialogue between China and the US remain dim, with Beijing saying their defense chiefs will not hold a bilateral meeting while both are attending a weekend security conference in Singapore.

Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning on Tuesday blamed the US, saying Washington should "earnestly respect China's sovereignty and security interests and concerns, immediately correct the wrongdoing, show sincerity, and create the necessary atmosphere and conditions for dialogue and communication between the two militaries." Mao gave no details, but tensions between the sides have spiked over Washington's military support and sales of defensive weapons to self-governing Taiwan, China's assertions of sovereignty to the contested South China Sea and its flying of a suspected spy balloon over the US.

US Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin is scheduled to address the Shangri-La Dialogue on Saturday, while Chinese Defense Minister Gen. Li Shangfu will speak at the gathering on Sunday.

Austin met privately with Li's predecessor, Wei Fenghe, at last year's Shangri-La Dialogue, which appeared to do little to smooth relations between the sides. In his address to the forum, Wei accused the US of seeking to contain China's development and threatening to assert its claim to Taiwan by military force.

Chinese leader Xi Jinping and U.S. President Joe Biden met on the sidelines of the Group of 20 meeting of large economies in November in Indonesia, but contacts have proceeded only sporadically since then, with only side meetings on neutral territory.

Secretary of State Antony Blinken canceled a visit to Beijing in February after the US shot down a Chinese spy balloon that had crossed the United States.

He later met with the Communist Party's senior foreign affairs adviser Wang Yi in Austria.

China refused to take a phone call from Austin to discuss the balloon issue, the Pentagon said.

China launches first spaceship with civilian

Beijing/Jiuquan (PTI): China on Tuesday successfully launched the Shenzhou-16 manned spaceship, sending three astronauts, including the first civilian to its space station combination for a five-month mission.

The spaceship, atop a Long March-2F carrier rocket, blasted off from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre in northwest China at 9:31 AM (Beijing Time), according to the China Manned



Space Agency (CMSA).

About 10 minutes after the launch, Shenzhou-16 separated from the rocket and entered its designated orbit. The crew members are in good shape and the launch is a complete success, the CMSA declared, it said. The astronauts are expected to dock with the station's Tianhe core module about 400km above the ground - after a journey of less than seven hours.

For the first time, China has included a civilian in its rotating crew for the space station which otherwise remained a domain of the military personnel. Gui Haichao, a professor at Beihang University in Beijing regarded as a payload specialist was among the three astronauts.

The other two are mission's commander Jing Haipeng, who is also making history by becoming the first Chinese astronaut to go into space for a record fourth time.

The astronaut flight engineer Zhu Yangzhu is also making his first journey into space.

The Shenzhou-16 will be the first crew mission after China's space station programme entered the stage of application and development, Lin Xiqiang, deputy director of the CMSA told the media on Monday. The trio will stay in orbit for about five months, he said.

Once ready, China will be the only country to own a space station as the International Space Station (ISS) of Russia is a collaborative project of several countries. The ISS station is also set to be decommissioned by 2030.

The significant feature of China's space station is its two robotic arms, especially the long one which has the ability to grab objects, including satellites from space. After entering orbit, the Shenzhou-16 spaceship will make a fast, automated rendezvous and docking with the space station combination.

Musk meets Chinese FM

Beijing: China's foreign minister met Tesla Ltd. CEO Elon Musk on Tuesday and said strained US-Chinese relations require "mutual respect," while delivering a message of reassurance that foreign companies are welcome.

US-Chinese relations are especially tense after Washington shot down a Chinese balloon believed to be gathering intelligence and warned Beijing against supplying arms to Russia for its war against Ukraine. The Wall Street Journal reported China has rejected a request for its defense minister to meet the U.S. defense secretary when both are in Singapore this weekend.

"We need to keep the steering wheel in the right direction of mutual respect, peaceful coexistence and win-win cooperation," Qin Gang told Musk, according to a ministry statement. The two sides should "avoid dangerous driving," Qin said. He gave no details of steps to improve relations.

Russia: Moscow buildings lightly damaged, while Kviy bombarded

A rare drone attack jolted Moscow early Tuesday, causing only light damage but forcing evacuations as residential buildings were struck in the Russian capital for the first time in the war against Ukraine.

The Kremlin, meanwhile, pursued its relentless bombardment of Kyiv with a third assault on the city in 24 hours.

The Russian Defence Ministry said five drones were shot down in Moscow and the systems of three others were jammed, causing them to veer off course.

President Vladimir Putin called it a "terrorist" act by Kyiv. The attack, causing only what Moscow Mayor Sergei Sobyenin called "insignificant damage" to several buildings, brought the war home to civilians in Russia's capital.

Two people received treatment for unspecified injuries but did not need hospitalisation, he said in a Telegram post, adding that residents of two high-rise buildings damaged in the attack were evacuated.

Andrei Vorobyov, governor of the wider Moscow region, said some of the drones were "shot down on the approach to Moscow."

Ukraine made no direct comment on the attack, which would be one of its deepest and most daring strikes into Russia since the Kremlin launched its full-scale invasion of Ukraine more than 15 months ago.

Putin said Moscow's air defense "worked in a satisfactory way," but added it is "clear that our task is to plug the gaps" in the system.

"It has been a real pleasure working in partnership with the India Consulate – with whom we have an excellent link – to develop this new open access climate change course," said Professor Reay.

"Huge thanks to the online course development team here at Edinburgh, and to the wonderful translation work led by our colleagues in the India Consulate, in bringing this important new course to life," he said.

9 hurt in shooting near beach in Hollywood

HOLLYWOOD (US): Nine people were injured Monday evening when gunfire erupted along a beach boardwalk in Hollywood, Florida, sending people frantically running for cover along the crowded beach on Memorial Day.

Several of the victims were taken to a children's hospital, police spokesperson Deanna Bettineschi said. However, authorities have not yet released the ages of the victims.

The nine victims included six adults and three children, according to Yanet Obarrio Sanchez, a spokesperson for Memorial Healthcare System. All of the victims were in stable condition, she said.

A preliminary investigation shows that an altercation between two groups resulted in gunfire, police said. One person has been detained and another suspect is being still being sought.

The shooting happened about 6:30 p.m. on the boardwalk near a convenience store, a Ben & Jerry's ice cream store and a Subway sandwich shop.

Alvie Carlton Scott III said he was on the beach when all of a sudden he heard numerous gunshots go off. He said he hid behind a tree and then fled the area after a police officer told people to run.

Jamie Ward, who was also on the boardwalk, said several young men were fighting in front of the stores when one pulled a gun and started shooting. Videos posted on Twitter on Monday evening showed emergency medical crews responding and providing aid to multiple injured people.

"The Kyiv regime ... attempts to intimidate Russian citizens and strikes at civilian buildings," he said at a public event, responding to a question from the head of a Kremlin-allied think tank.

"It is, of course, a clear indication of terrorist activity," Asked by The Associated Press whether there is high-level concern that the invasion of Ukraine is endangering Russian civilians, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said only that attacks on Russia reinforce the need to prosecute the war.

Russian political analyst Tatiana Stanovaya, a senior fellow at the Carnegie Russia Eurasia Center, said the Kremlin's policy is to play down the attacks.

"You ask, why is Putin behaving like this, does he really not understand and fear the consequences?" she wrote in a Telegram post.

Crucial days ahead as debt ceiling deal goes for vote

Biden calls lawmakers for support

President Joe Biden says he "feels good" about the debt ceiling and budget deal negotiated with House Speaker Kevin McCarthy as the White House and congressional leaders work to ensure its passage this week in time to lift the nation's borrowing limit and prevent a disastrous US default. Biden spent part of the Memorial Day holiday working the phones, calling lawmakers in both parties, as the president does his part to deliver the votes.

A number of hard right conservatives are criticising the deal as falling short of the deep spending cuts they want-

ed, while liberals decry policy changes such as new work requirements for older Americans in the food aid programme.

A key test will come Tuesday afternoon when the House Rules Committee is scheduled to consider the package and vote on sending it to the full House for a vote expected Wednesday. "I feel very good about it," Biden told reporters Monday as he left Washington for his home in Delaware.

"I've spoken to a number of the members," he said, among them Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell, a past partner in big bipartisan deals who largely sat this one out.

"I spoke to a whole bunch of people, and it feels good," Biden said. To those progressive Democrats raising concerns about the package, the president had a simple message: "Talk to me."

As lawmakers size up the 99-page bill, few are expected to be fully satisfied with the final product.

But Biden, a Democrat, and McCarthy, a Republican, are counting on pulling majority support from the political centre, a rarity in divided Washington, to join in voting to prevent a catastrophic federal default. Wall Street will open early Tuesday morning delivering its own assessment, as the US financial markets that had been closed when the deal was struck over the weekend show their reaction to the outcome.

McCarthy acknowledged the hard-fought compromise with Biden will not be "100% of what everybody wants" as he leads a slim House majority powered by hard-right conservatives. Facing potential blowback from his conservative ranks, the Republican speaker will have to rely on upwards of half the House Democrats and half the House Republicans to push the debt ceiling package to passage.

Sunak clamps down on free vapes for children

"My daughters are 10 and 12, and I don't want the way vapes are marketed, promoted and sold to be attractive to them," British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak said on Tuesday as he launched a crackdown to protect children from "rogue companies and online crooks".

Announcing the new set of measures aimed at curbing under-age vaping, Sunak said expressed his shock at reports of illicit vapes containing lead getting into the hands of schoolchildren.

Taking to Twitter, the father of schoolgirls Anoushka and Krishna said: "My daughters are 10 and 12, and I don't want the way vapes are marketed, promoted and sold to be attractive to them." "That's why I am launching a new crackdown today to protect children and go after the rogue companies and online crooks who are putting vapes into their hands," he said. India's growth momentum to continue in FY24: RBI

The Reserve Bank on Tuesday said that India's growth momentum is likely to continue in 2023-24 even as it made a case for pushing structural reforms to deal with the geopolitical developments and also to achieve sustained growth in the medium-term.

The Reserve Bank's annual report flagged slowing global growth, protracted geopolitical tensions and a possible upsurge in financial market volatility as possible downside risks to growth.

The report notes that volatility has ebbed in global financial markets and risks to financial stability from the failure of banks in some advanced economies (AEs) in March 2023 have eased. Resolute policy actions have stemmed the tide of confidence runs for now.

"Amidst strong global head-



winds, the Indian economy is expected to have recorded a growth of 7.0 per cent in real GDP in 2022-23," it said.

A sustained recovery in discretionary spending, particularly in contact intensive services, restoration of consumer confidence, high festival season spending after two consecutive years of COVID-19 induced isolation and the government's thrust on capex provided impetus to the growth momentum. In the second half of the year, however, the pace of year-on-year growth moderated because of unfavourable base effects, weakening private consumption demand caused by high inflation, slowdown in export growth and

sustained input cost pressures, it said.

"On the back of sound macro-economic policies, softer commodity prices, a robust financial sector, a healthy corporate sector, continued fiscal policy thrust on quality of government expenditure, and new growth opportunities stemming from global realignment of supply chains, India's growth momentum is likely to be sustained in 2023-24 in an atmosphere of easing inflationary pressures," the report said.

Slowing global growth, protracted geopolitical tensions and a possible upsurge in financial market volatility following new stress events in the global financial system, however, could pose downside risks to growth.

"It is important, therefore, to sustain structural reforms to improve India's medium-term growth potential," the 311-page report said.

RBI working on light weight, portable payment system for critical transactions during catastrophic events

Reserve Bank of India is working on a light weight and portable payment system, a "bunker equivalent in payment systems", that can be used for critical transactions during catastrophic events like natural calamities and war.

The proposed Light weight and Portable Payment System (LPPS) will be independent of conventional technologies and can be operated from anywhere by a bare minimum staff, according to the central bank. Existing conventional payment systems like RTGS

(Real Time Gross Settlement), NEFT (National Electronic Funds Transfer) and UPI (Unified Payments Interface) are designed to handle large volumes while ensuring sustained availability. These systems are dependent on complex wired networks backed by advanced IT infrastructure.

However, catastrophic events like natural calamities and war have the potential to render these payment systems temporarily unavailable by disrupting the underlying information and communication infrastructure, RBI said in its latest annual report released on Tuesday.

CBDC pilot expanded; to include more banks, locations: Reserve Bank

The Reserve Bank on Tuesday said the scope of the Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) pilot is being expanded gradually to include more banks and locations.

The first pilot in the Digital Rupee - Wholesale Segment (e rupee-W) commenced on November 1, 2022. It was followed by the first pilot for retail digital rupee (e rupee-R) was announced on December 1, 2022.

Retail digital rupee offers features of physical cash like trust, safety and settlement finality in digital mode.

It can be held or used to carry out transactions, similar to how currency notes can be used in physical form, the RBI said in its annual report.

The pilot was launched in Mumbai, New Delhi, Bengaluru and Bhubaneswar,



comprising participating customers and merchants in a closed user group (CUG).

Other locations, including Ahmedabad, Chandigarh, Gangtok, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Indore, Kochi, Lucknow, Patna and Shimla are also being added to the pilot in phases.

The pilot began with four banks -- State Bank of India, ICICI Bank, Yes Bank and IDFC First Bank -- while four other banks -- Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, HDFC Bank and Kotak Mahindra Bank have joined subsequently.

Hardening interest rates, geo-political risks impacting FDI inflows: DPIIT Secy

Hardening interest rates globally and worsening geo-political situation have impacted the foreign direct investment (FDI) inflows into India in 2022-23, a top government official said on Tuesday.

Secretary of the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) Rajesh Kumar Singh said that the department would analyse the reasons for the contraction in FDI in five important sectors like computer hardware and software; construction, education, automobiles and metallurgical industries.

"I cannot think of any other reason. It is not as if our FDI policies have become protectionist. On the contrary, we have kept it very very liberal ... The decline is combination of hardening of interest rates along with geo-political risks going up around the world. In general the appetite may be less," Singh told PTI in an interview.

These five sectors had a share of USD 30 billion in India's total FDI in 2021-22 and in the last fiscal year, overseas inflows have almost halved.

"Why exactly in those sectors (FDI) has come down is to be analysed. We will have to analyse," he added.

FDI equity inflows into India declined by 22 per cent to USD 46 billion in 2022-23. The investments during the January-March 2023 quarter plunged by 40.55 per cent to USD 9.28 billion.

Though the computer software and hardware sector attracted the highest inflows of USD 9.4 billion during the last financial year, these inflows are down as compared to USD 14.5 billion in 2021-22.


Similarly, FDI in the automobile industry dipped significantly to USD 1.9 billion in 2022-23 as compared to about USD 7 billion in 2021-22.

However, the secretary added that the government is doing investment promotion on a large scale and the inflows would start recovering.

The secretary added that sectors which have received healthy inflows include information and broadcasting, agri machinery, railway-related components, medical appliances, defence industries and scientific instruments.

Jadeja proved fairy tales exist in sport: Fleming

Stephen Fleming doesn't believe in fairy tales in sport but Ravindra Jadeja's near-improbable heist that took Chennai Super Kings to its fifth IPL trophy might come closest to it.

With 13 needed to win in the final over against Gujarat Titans, CSK managed only three runs off the first four balls before Jadeja smashed Mohit Sharma for a six and a four off the last two deliveries to literally snatch the Cup from Gujarat's grasp.

"They say there are no fairy tales in the sport, but it was a pretty good one today. It has been a bit difficult 18 months where, as the captaincy was difficult, the injury was difficult, it took a bit of time from out of the game for him to come back into and be reintegrated into the Test side, and then re-integrate into CSK," Fleming told the media after Chennai defeated Gujarat Titans in the IPL final here.

In fact, Fleming had in his mind conceded defeat before final two deliveries were bowled by Mohit and the Jadeja turned it all.

"We have lost finals on the last ball which is an absolute heartache. I was gearing up myself for another heartache when Jaddu hit one for six and there could have been more heartache or more joy, I was not sure.

"But when I saw the ball go down, finally there was pure joy. This competition takes you to emotional levels that you cannot imagine," the Kiwi added.

Fleming was all praise for Jadeja's firepower.

"He plays a great role with the ball, but we have got so much fire power, that some ways we use him down the order, but something has to give. MS (Dhoni) has been very supportive and proactive in getting him up there and today he repaid that faith," Fleming added.

The former New Zealand skipper explained Jadeja's shot selection.

"The six, I think, in particular of the ball which was pretty close to being perfect, was defining, and then left-handed drive to the fine leg. It was a great way to finish it. I could-



n't be more happy for him. There has been some frustration at times, but he is our gun player, he is a No 1 ranked player and today he delivered," Fleming added.

The CSK coach said his side was poor in the field in the first half, but kept getting better and confident as the rain-affected match panned out.

"215... I thought it was an excellent score but the rain came and we

had to change the momentum. We felt with the moisture around on the pitch, it was gettable. It was going to take a lot of batting.

"The start was really important because we were still shell-shocked from the fielding. The first four or six overs started to give us the belief and once we got a little bit of taste for it, it is that type of ground where it is very hard to defend, so we knew we

had a chance. It was going to be high octane all the way through," Fleming added.

Fleming praised Gujarat Titans bowlers Mohammad Shami and Mohit Sharma for taking the contest into the final ball of the match.

"The last couple of overs were very tight. Shami and Sharma bowled well, Mohit Sharma in particular has been very good," he said.

Cricket has always been a game of fine margins, believes Fleming, who has been CSK coach for a decade and half now.

"I think I said it a couple of days ago that this tournament is being defined by fine margins. I think the last couple of balls summed that up — if you just missed a yorker or go down the leg side.

"My understanding is that we got rid of the tag of being the guy you bat around or bat through. I think that maybe hung over his head a little bit too much and didn't allow him to be the player that he can be.

"And once that tag was gone, when I turned up halfway through the pre-season training, I saw a guy who was in magnificent form," Fleming said.

Fleming said that Rahane didn't feature in their initial plan.

"He wasn't in our initial thoughts, but the game in Mumbai was really defining. It was one of our best wins in the tournament and he was the big

catalyst behind it, so he cemented that No. 3 spot.

"He has been unwavering the whole way through he's been nothing but positive, his nets have been positive. Anytime he's been caught on the boundary or out playing a big shot, we've just reinforced how good he's playing. So a little bit of belief and just sheer ability — he's been a wonderful player for us this year," he said.

'RAYUDU WOULD LEAVE A BIG HOLE'

The former New Zealand captain said Ambati Rayudu, who announced his retirement after this IPL final, will leave a big hole in their side.

"Ambati Rayudu has been an absolute legend. I rate him so highly as a batter and those three balls against Mohit Sharma today proved against one of the most in-form bowlers... to hit him for 6, 4 and 6 was sheer class.

"Rayudu will leave a hole, there is no doubt about it, but the game keeps moving. Doesn't it? We expected that for him to go out like that was pretty emotional within the group and for him as well," Fleming said.

It will be a big challenge for India to come out of T20 mould and play WTC final: Gavaskar

Legendary cricketer Sunil Gavaskar feels emerging from the IPL T20 mode will be the biggest challenge for the Indian players when they take on Australia in the World Test Championship (WTC) final against Australia next week.

Rohit Sharma's India will play the WTC final at The Oval from June 7 with a majority of the players having come through the rigours of IPL, which concluded on Monday with Chennai Super Kings lifting the trophy for a record-equalling fifth time.

"The biggest test will be the fact that just about everybody will be coming out of a T20 for-

mat, and Test cricket is a longer format. So, I think that's going to be the big challenge," said Gavaskar on Star Sports on Tuesday.

He added that among all the India players only veteran batter Cheteshwar Pujara was well acclimatised to the longer format as he has been playing county cricket.

"They (India) have only Cheteshwar Pujara who has been playing in the English County Championship, so he will be the only guy who has played the longer format in these conditions, so that's going to be the big challenge for them."

On Ajinkya Rahane, who after a long form slump has come back strongly in the IPL and helped CSK win the title this season, Gavaskar said the 34-year-old's experience of English conditions will be beneficial to the side.

"He's got a lot of experience having played in England, having scored runs in England. So, yes, I think he is going to be crucial down at number 5. And yes, I do believe he has a point to prove. I still feel he has got plenty of cricket left in him, and this is a wonderful opportunity for him."

Sameer, Kiran, Ashmita enter main draw of Thailand Open

Indian shuttlers Sameer Verma, Kiran George and Ashmita Chaliha notched up straight-game wins over their respective opponents in the qualifying round to progress to the main draw of the singles event at the Thailand Open Super 500 badminton tournament here on Tuesday.

On a comeback trail, former world number 11 Sameer, who won the Slovenia Open recently, beat Malaysia's Yeoh Seng Zoe 21-12, 21-17 after getting two walkovers — Indonesia's Christian Adinata and Spain's Luis Enrique Penalver in the previous rounds.

The 28-year-old from Dhar, who had won three titles in 2018, will face Denmark's Magnus

Johannesen in the opening round of the main draw. Kiran, the 2022 Odisha Open winner, outwitted fellow Indian Kartikey Gulshan Kumar 21-14, 21-18 and then defeated Korea's Jeon Hyeok Jin 21-10, 21-14 to make it to the main draw. He will face third seed Chinese Shi Yuqi on Wednesday.

In women's singles, Ashmita Chaliha, who recently topped BAT's selection trials to make it to individual events of the upcoming Asian Games, saw off fellow Indian Unnati Hooda 21-16, 13-21, 21-19 before beating Estonian Kristin Kuuba 21-19, 21-11 in the second match.

The girl from Assam will meet compatriot Malvika Bansod, who was promoted to the main draw.

Hardik could have been valuable addition for India in WTC final: Ponting

Batting legend Ricky Ponting feels that India should have picked Hardik Pandya in their squad for the World Test Championships final against Australia in London, saying his all-round abilities could have turned out to be the deciding factor in the one-off game.

Pandya has not played a Test since 2018 and he has opted sit out of the five-day format due to ongoing fitness concerns.

But Ponting felt Pandya could have played in the winner-takes all clash at The Oval from June 7-11. Primarily because he has bowled in more or less every game in the just-concluded IPL for Gujarat Titans which he captains.

"...I thought about the other day for India in this game is how valuable someone like Hardik Pandya could be in a one-off Test match," Ponting wrote for



the ICC Review.

"I know he is on record saying that the Test match game is probably a little bit hard on his body. But for a one-off game... He's been bowling every game through this IPL and he's bowling quick."

The former Australia captain, also the head coach of Delhi Capitals in the IPL, said Pandya

could have been the X-factor for the Indian team in the WTC final beginning on June 7.

"He (Pandya) could be that X-factor there just to pick in a one-off game, come in and see what he can do with bat and ball. He could be the difference between the two teams."

The 29-year-old Pandya has played in 11 Tests till now after making his debut in 2017, scoring 532 runs at an average of 31.29 with one hundred and four fifties. He has taken 17 wickets at an average of 31.05.

In the 74 ODIs he has played so far, Pandya has scored 1584 runs at an average of 33.00 and taken 72 wickets. In the T20Is, he has scored 1271 runs from 87 matches and scalped 69 wickets.

Pandya led Gujarat Titans to maiden IPL triumph in 2022 but lost to Mahendra Singh Dhoni's Chennai Super Kings in this season's final on Monday.

MEDVEDEV OUT OF FRENCH OPEN

World number two Daniil Medvedev was knocked out of the French Open in the first round on Tuesday, losing in five sets to 172nd-ranked Thiago Seyboth Wild of Brazil.

Seyboth Wild, who came through the qualifiers and had never previously won a Grand Slam match, triumphed 7-6 (7/5), 6-7 (6/8), 2-6, 6-3, 6-4. It was Medvedev's fifth loss in the opening round at Roland Garros in seven appearances.

"I have watched Daniil play in my junior years. It's a dream come true to beat these kinds of players on this court," said the 23-year-old Brazilian who unleashed 69 winners past the Russian.

"I just wanted to get my angles right, get to the net as much as possible and use my forehand as much as possible against his — I guess it worked pretty well." He added: "I was cramping in the second set and couldn't really serve the way I wanted to but I tried to play my best tennis. I'm really happy with the way I played."

Seyboth Wild, without a win on the main tour since February 2022, had squandered two set points which would have given him a two-sets lead.

Medvedev made him pay, levelling the tie and then claiming a double break in the third set.

But the Brazilian hit back, a double break of his own in the fourth set levelling the clash as a fractious Medvedev bickered with the crowd.

In the final set, Seyboth Wild twice saw breaks retrieved by the Russian before he finally backed up a third break with a hold for 5-3.

He held his nerve to clinch the four-hour 15-minute match courtesy of two giant forehands and will face either Guido Pella or Quentin Halys for a place in the last 32.

Medvedev arrived in Paris buoyed by winning his first ever clay court title at the prestigious Italian Open last week for his fifth trophy of 2023.

But he has endured a bitter-sweet relationship with the French Open, losing in the first round in his first four visits. He ended that streak with a run to the quarter-finals in 2021.

ZVEREV WINS

Alexander Zverev made a winning return to Roland Garros on Tuesday with a straight-sets win over Lloyd Harris in the French Open first round,



12 months since suffering a serious ankle injury in the semi-finals.

The German had to retire injured from a dramatic last-four clash with Rafael Nadal last season after twisting his ankle and did not play again in 2022.

That match had already reached three hours and was locked at 6-6 in the second set after Nadal won a first-set tie-break when Zverev suffered torn ankle ligaments and had to be taken off Court Philippe Chatrier in a wheelchair.

Zverev, who was the third seed last

year, is only seeded 22nd this time around after struggling to recapture his best form since returning to the ATP Tour.

But the former US Open finalist had enough to beat South African Harris 7-6 (8/6), 7-6 (7/0), 6-1.

"It's nice to be back. I've marked this day in bold on my calendar since last year," Zverev said.

"I was obviously very disappointed with how that tournament ended for me (last year).

"That's why I think I appreciate even more when I play in a full stadium and the crowd is behind me."

Zverev went out in the first round in 2017 and needed five sets to win his opening tie at Roland Garros in both 2019 and 2021.

"No (not happy with his performance). But I'm happy that I won in three sets. Normally I start with five-set matches so I'm happy to win in three."

Zverev will next face Slovakia's Alex

Molcan as he tries to reach the third round for a sixth straight year.

He came back to the Tour at the start of 2023 but has since slipped from 12th to 27th in the rankings.

Zverev, who has won three of his five Masters titles on clay, failed to reach the quarter-finals in each of Monte Carlo, Madrid and Rome this season.

"Get some more wins. Get six more wins in the next two weeks," said the Olympic champion when asked what he wants to improve.



Van der Sar to quit as Ajax chief after 'tough period'

Former Netherlands goalkeeper Edwin van der Sar on Tuesday announced that he was quitting as Ajax chief executive, after "an incredibly tough period" of more than a decade at the helm of the Amsterdam powerhouse.

Van der Sar's resignation comes on the back of the worst season in 14 years for the top Dutch club which finished third in the Eredivisie after a 3-1 drubbing by FC Twente on Sunday.

"After almost 11 years on the board, I am done," Van der Sar, 52, said in a statement.

"We have experienced wonderful things together, but it has also been an incredibly tough period," the former Manchester United 'keeper said, who retired from professional football in 2011. Ajax have failed to qualify for the Champions League after finishing third in the Eredivisie behind Feyenoord and PSV Eindhoven.

Media reports including the NOS public broadcaster and daily tabloid De Telegraaf said supporters held Van der Sar responsible for the club's drop in success, following the departure of sporting director Marc Overmars and trainer Erik ten Hag.

Former Dutch international Overmars quit after admitting sending inappropriate messages to female staff at Ajax, while the successful Ten Hag left for Manchester United in April last year.

Van der Sar said he needed to "take some distance, to get some rest, and to do other things."

Ajax supervisory board chairman Pier Eringa said the club "wanted Edwin to stay, but he had made his decision. We have to respect that."

Van der Sar's contract ran until June 30, 2025.

"The last season does not reflect the entire period that he has been in charge of Ajax," Eringa stressed.

Regarded as one of the world's all-time best goalkeepers, Van der Sar played for Ajax from 1990-1999, winning the Champions League in 1995.

He went on to lift the European Cup again in 2008 with Manchester United after spells at Juventus and Fulham.

Van der Sar returned to Ajax in 2012 as director of marketing before being promoted four years later to CEO. He is also the second-highest capped Netherlands player of all-time with 130 international appearances.

maximise driving range and efficiency. It comes equipped with four regenerative braking levels, where-in 'i-PEDAL' driving mode allows the car to harvest the maximum amount of energy from brakes and enables the driver to bring the vehicle to a gentle halt without needing to push the brake pedal.

KIA EV6 is one of the safest EVs available in India, with eight airbags, all-wheel disc brakes, ABS, ESC, HAC, MCBA, BAS, VSM, ESS, front and rear parking sensors, besides the ISOFIX child anchor.
