# **SC: Can grant divorce at** once if all bridges burned

In case of 'irretrievable breakdown', SC can dissolve marriage sans 6-month waiting time, but contesting parties can't move apex court directly, rules SC

the territory of India The Supreme Court held on Monday that it has the discretion to dissolve a marriage divorce by mutual consent and on the ground of "irretrievable sub-section (2) to this provision breakdown" in exercise of its plenary power under Article 142(1) of the Constitution, and it can grant divorce by mutual consent while dispensing with the 6-month waiting period mandated under the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 of the first motion.

The apex court also said that contesting parties cannot directly approach it and seek dissolution of marriage on the ground of irretrievable breakdown by filing a writ petition under Article 32 of the Constitution. Article 32 gives Indian citizens the right to seek constitutional remedy from the Supreme Court if they have been deprived of their

fundamental rights. Article 142 of the Constitution deals with enforcement of decrees and orders of the apex court to do "complete justice" in any matter pending before it. As per

The weekend (April 30) turned out to be a 'Super Sunday' of sorts for the Ministry of Civil

Aviation as domestic air passenger traffic touched an "all-time high" of 4,56,082 travellers in a single day. This is the highest turnover of domestic

air passengers since November 2022. Prior to Covid, the average daily domestic traffic was 3,98,579 passengers.

According to the Aviation Ministry, on Sunday 4,56,082 passengers were ferried on the 2,978 flights. On April 29, as many as 4.50 lakh domestic flyers were ferried on 2,975 flights by scheduled airlines.

 $T^{ ext{he BJP on Monday}}_{ ext{promised in its manifesto}}$ for Karnataka the implementation of the Uniform Civil Code (UCC), introduction of the National Register of Citizens, 10 lakh jobs in the manufacturing sector and a State Capital Region tag for Bengaluru, besides free cooking gas cylinders thrice a year for BPL families and "Atal" food centres to provide affordable and healthy food.

In a bid to outmatch the Congress which is yet to release its manifesto, the BJP also seeks to launch the "Poshan" scheme through which every BPL household will be provided with half litre "Nandini" milk every day and five kg "Shri Anna" through monthly ration.

The Congress, which is trying hard to make a come-

back in the State, has during the back in the State, has during the course of the campaign had already made a rainbow of promises to voters, including 200 units of free power to all homes, 10 kg of rice to BPL households, ₹2,000 monthly assistance to the woman head in every family and a monthly allowance of ₹3,000 to unem-ployed graduates in the State. ployed graduates in the State. ¬he British Raj era military L cantonments all over the country will be history soon with the first such canton-ment in Yol, Himachal Pradesh shedding the tag of the "fauji" area. There are a total of 62 can tonments and the next in line to go is Nasirabad in Rajasthan.

Giving details here on Monday, sources said the Government issued the notifi-cation for Yol last week adding in a major departure from the archaic colonial practice of creating cantonments, Yol in Himachal Pradesh has shed its tag as a cantonment.

The Military Area within the Cantonment will be converted into a Military Station and the Civil Area will merge with the Municipality.

Contrary to perception, this move will prove beneficial to all alike. Civilians who were, until now, not getting access to state government welfare schemes through the



Municipality, will now be in a position to avail these through the Municipality. As far as the Army is concerned, they too could now focus on the development of the Military station. This is a first among a

series of excisions of cantonments and is a move that has been welcomed by all. Cantonments are deemed Municipalities and running Municipalities is a State subject.

There were 56 Cantonments at the time of Independence and 6 more were notified after 1947, last one being Ajmer in 1962.

cury soaring during the month. Delhi recorded 14.8 mm of rainfall on Monday while the minimum temperature was recorded at 19.6 degrees Celsius, five degrees below normal, the IMD said.

Heavy rainfall was report-ed from parts of South and Outer Delhi and Noida, while other areas of the national Capital witnessed light rain.

Traffic snarls and waterlogging were also reported in several parts of the national Capital making it difficult for the commuters to reach their destination on time.

The IMD has issued an orange alert for rainfall over a major part of northwest India for the next three days.

Delhi, too, will experience heavy showers for the next three days due to western dis-turbances. According to the IMD, the western disturbances are currently situated over Haryana along with Pakistan and adjoining areas, which will lead to rainfall in northwest India

He said the judgement reinforces the idea that delaying the grant of divorce in marriages that cannot be repaired only leads to prolonging the agony of the par-

ties. "The judgment reinforces the idea that where a marriage has irretrievably broken down, prolonging its dissolution only prolongs the agony of the parties. While the six months waiting period has been made mandatory with a view to explore the possibility of reconciliation, in cases where there is no possibility of reconciliation, this becomes a mere procedural formality," he added.

Activist Ranjana Kumari said there is no point in wasting time in case of "irretrievable breakdown of marriage".

the law then to still do the very same thing by a judicial order, according to me, is not appropriate," Singh said.

In its 61-page verdict, answering the question about the scope and ambit of power and jurisdiction of the apex court under Article 142(1) of the Constitution, the bench held the top court can depart from the procedure as well as the substantive laws, as long as the decision is exercised based on considerations of fundamental general and specific public policy. "While deciding whether to

exercise discretion, this court must consider the substantive provisions as enacted and not ignore the same, albeit this court acts as a problem solver by

balancing out equities between the conflicting claims. This power is to be exercised in a cause or matter," it said.

The apex court also dealt with another question as to whether it can, while hearing a transfer petition or in any other proceedings, exercise power under Article 142(1), in view of settlement between the parties, and grant a decree of divorce by mutual consent dispensing with the period and procedure prescribed under section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act.

It also considered if it can quash and dispose of other proceedings under the Domestic Violence Act, section 125 of the CrPC or criminal prosecution under section 498-A and other

provisions of the Indian Penal Code

While section 125 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) pertains to order for maintenance of wives, children and parents, section 498-A of the IPC deals with offence of subjecting a married woman to cru-

elty. "In view of our findings on the first question, this question has to be answered in the affirmative, inter alia, holding that this court, in view of settlement between the parties, has the discretion to dissolve the marriage by passing a decree of divorce by mutual consent, without being bound by the procedural requirement to move the second motion," the apex court said.

According to the International Air Transport Association (IATA) study, a revival in domestic travel to the pre-pandemic level has propelled India to the big league of major aviation markets.

Domestic travel in India missed the pre-Covid level by 2.2 per cent in February 2023 in terms of passenger revenue kilometres (PRK), the study said.

The growth in domestic travel is also seen in the Passenger Load Factor (PLF), which studies how efficient-

ly an airline fills seats and generates revenue. India is the top domestic market in terms of PLF when compared to countries such as the US, China and Japan, it said. India recorded PLFs of 81.6 per cent in February, 85.2 per cent in January, 88.9 per cent in December 2022, and 87.9 per

cent in November 2022.

Domestic air passenger traffic for all markets measured for February surged 25.2 per cent over the period a year-ago. Total Februarv 2023 domestic traffic was at 97.2 per cent of the February 2019 level.

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# **Kejriwal launches summer** plan to combat air pollution

### STAFF REPORTER NEW DELHI

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Monday launched an action plan to combat air pollution during the summer months with a focus on controlling dust pollution. The Delhi government already has a winter action plan to curb has a winter action plan to curb air pollution.

The winter plan focuses on stubble burning, firecracker pollution and industrial and vehicular emissions. "The summer plan involves the participation of 30 government departments. The summer plan, is a comprehensive set of 14 focus areas aimed at reducing air pollution levels. The primary focus of the action plan is on dust pollution, which has been a major contributor to the city's worsening air quality," Kejriwal said during a press conference.

"To tackle this, the government has procured 84 mechanical road sweeping machines, 609 water sprin-



klers and 185 mobile antismog guns. Additionally, 70 integrated road sweeping machines and 250 integrated water sprinklers are being procured to improve the situation further," he said.

Patrolling teams have been set up to check dust pollution, open burning of garbage and dumping of waste in industrial areas. The government will deploy 225 and 159 teams during days and nights, respec-

tively, to monitor dust pollution in the city. Real-time source apportionment studies will be



conducted at 13 air pollution hotspots and a mobile air lab deployed at each of these locations. Construction sites larger than 500 square metres will be closely monitored to check dust pollution.

The government has prepared a standard operating procedure to prevent fire incidents at landfill sites. A plan is also being prepared for the scientific disposal of industrial waste, the chief minister said. Kejriwal added that a spe-

cial team is being set up to improve the survival rate of

transplanted trees. The chief minister also claimed that Delhi's air pollution situation is improving while it continues to worsen in other parts of the country

Kejriwal said there has been a revolutionary change in Delhi's air pollution levels, with a reduction of 30 percent in pollution levels from 2016 to 2022-23. The number of severe AQI days has decreased from 26 in 2016 to 6 in 2022, while the number of very poor and severe AQI days has come down from 124 to 72. Providing some data, the Delhi CM highlighted that in 2016, there were 26 such days where the AQI was in the 'severe' category, but in 2022-23 there

were only 6 such days. He further added that in 2016 there were 124 days in the 'Very Poor' and 'Severe' category, and in 2022-23 these were reduced to 72 days. He said that there were 109 days in 2016 in the

Good/Satisfactory/Moderate

categories and this has further increased to 163 days in 2022-23.He further said that the most important factor to reduce pollution is to work in coordination with the neighbouring state governments.

'The air does not belong to any one state. It is not as if the air in Delhi does not go to Haryana or the air from there does not come to Delhi. The same air moves around in the entire area, and therefore we are working in close coordination with our neighbouring states to curb air pollution", he said.

He also said that the state government was working in association with both the NDMC and MCD to sustain parks in the city. He said that there are around 3500 parks in Delhi that are greater than half an acre and these should be beautified by December this year. He said that there are a total of 17,000 parks under the MCD and these will be beautified by March next year.

## 3 expelled for Jamia scuffle

### STAFF REPORTER NEW DELHI

Jamia Millia Islamia has taken disciplinary action against 15 students, including expulsion of three for their involvement in a scuffle between two groups in September that had resulted in a student sustaining bullet injuries.

The punishments range from expulsion, campus ban, no hostel accommodation and monetary compensation to furnishing a bond of good conduct as per the gravity of charges against the student, a senior varsity official said. Three out of 15 students have only been allowed to give examinations with a 5year campus ban and have been barred from admission in any other course at the university after completion of their course, the official said.

'The disciplinary actions have been taken after the due procedure and to set an example that the university will not tolerate any kind of indiscipline on the campus," Jamia Registrar Nazim Husain Al Jafri reportedly said. The students who have been expelled are identified as Mujeebur Rehman, BA (Hons) Political Science; Salman Khursid, BA programme; and Mohd. Faisal, MA (Social Exclusion) for disturbing the peaceful environment of the university and inciting students for fighting, the officials said. The notices issued on April 24 to Rehman and Khursid mention that they did not appear before the disciplinary committee to defend their case. The notice furnished to Faisal mentions that the "committee took into account activities carried out by him during the period of suspension and cam-

pus ban" While Rehman and Khursid could not be contacted despite repeated attempts, Faisal refused to comment on the matter.In September last year, two groups of students engaged in multiple brawls on and outside the campus. In one of the skirmishes, a student sustained bullet injuries in a hospital. Following the incident, the university suspended several students for 'spoiling" the peaceful academic environment. The matter was taken up by the disciplinary committee of the university for

further action. In its meetings held on April 6, 2023 in the Mir Anis Hall, Administrative Block and subsequent meeting held on April 10 in the Committee Room, Registrar Office, the committee "took a serious view" of the involvement of these students "in the name of regional conflict resulting in the series of fights between students of Western UP and Mewat Region on September 29 on the university campus and at Holy Family Hospital," according to the notices served to each student.

"The students were given show-cause notice. The committee held multiple meetings and hearings and then decided on the punishment to the stu-

dents," the registrar asserted. Out of 15, five Diploma in Electrical Engineering students — Suhail Nasrullah Ansari,

preted to last just 14 years. "Life imprisonment, when awarded as a substitute for

death penalty, has to be carried out strictly as directed by the court and would be beyond application of remission," she

said in her petition before the Supreme Court. Mohan's name figured in a list of more than 20 prisoners who were ordered to be set free by a notification issued by the state's law department earlier this week as they had spent more than 14 years behind the bars.

The remission of his sentence followed an April 10 amendment to the Bihar Prison Manual by the Nitish Kumar government whereby the restriction on early release of those involved in killing of a public servant on duty was done away with.

This, the critics of the State Government's decision claim, was done to facilitate the release of Mohan, a Rajput strongman, who could add heft to the grand alliance led by Nitish Kumar in its fight against the BJP. Several others, including politicians, benefited from the amendment to the state prison rules.

Krishnaiah, who hailed from Telangana, was beaten to death by a mob in 1994 when his vehicle tried to overtake the funeral procession of gangster Chhotan Shukla in Muzaffarpur district. Mohan, then an MLA, was leading the procession.

## ICMR sets up 'Hub & Spoke model' to stop breast cancer deaths in India

### ARCHANA JYOTI NEW DELHI

oncerned at the low survival rates in breast cancer in India—as low as 66 per cent when compared to over 90 per cent in the western world, the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has initiated steps to set up a Hub and Spoke Network of hospitals to ensure quality care in the sector across the country.

Under the Hub and Spoke model, the ICMR will identify hospitals with best survival rates for breast cancer from East, West, North, South and North-East India which could mentor other institutes with poor survival rates to bring uniformity in breast cancer treatment. "The project will work on a Hub and Spoke model with a co-ordinating rate

Headquarters in the national capital. Hubs will be distributed over the five regions of the country (North, South, East, West and North-east) and will function as nodal points for that region. These Centres will include institutes/medical colleges/hospitals of repute with experience and expertise in conducting multicentre studies," explained an official from the ICMR.

In this regard, the premier research body has sought expression of interest from the hospitals across the countries to initiate breast cancer survival studies spanning the next three years. "Currently because of poor health resources in the cancer care segment, at stage II, breast cancer survival rate is 66-70 per cent in India as compared to developed countries, h is 90- 99 per cent. Only

those hospitals can be part of this network which have cancer based registry and implementing Ayushman Bharat scheme. Those reporting at least 1000 new breast cancer cases annually will serve as Hub while Spoke categories will have 500-500 new breast cancer cases.

Breast cancer is on rise in the country. According to a study by Globocon 2020, In India, every four minutes a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer. With some 1,78,000 new cases being diag-nosed every year, the inci-dence of breast cancer has overtaken cervical cancer to become the most common cancer in Indian women. She said that each regional hub, thus identified, will act as the mentoring body for a region,

### Dhami briefs Modi on Researchers discover two colourful spiders

### PIONEER NEWS SERVICE

Two new species of colour-ful spiders, usually covered with metallic iridescent scales, jumping spiders which have been discovered from southern India— Phintelladhritiae' from Wildlife Mookambika Sanctuary in Karnataka and 'Phintellaplatnicki' from Salem district of Tamil Nadu-now adorn the country's web of fauna.

The researchers Souvik Sen and Sudhin P P, from ZSI, Kolkata and John T D Caleb from Chennai discovered these new species of spiders.

'Phintelladhritiae' has been named in honour of Dr Dhriti Banerjee, the first woman director of the ZSI. Banerjee had taken over as the director of the more-than-100-year-old institution in August 2021. 'Phintellaplatnicki' has also been named in honour of late Dr Norman Platnick for his contribution to the field of arachnology, said a statement



from the ZSI here. Arachnology is the scientific study of arachnids, which comprise spiders and related invertebrates such as scorpions and pseudoscorpions. The newly described species, which belong to the genus Phintella, are small-to-medium sized, colourful spiders, usually covered with metallic iridescent

scales, the statement said. The head is somewhat rounded or oval, relatively high with a distinct posterior slope, while the abdomen is ovoid or elongate, usually with pale and dark horizontal bands. Members of this genus generally inhabit under leaves and

bark of shrubs and grasses, the ZSI statement said. Before the discovery of these new species of jumping spiders, 12 species of Phintella were known to be valid from India. The discoverv of these new species came up in the March 2023 issue of 'Arthropoda Selecta', a prestigious journal.

Earlier this year, the team described another two new jumping spiders-'Stenaelurillusmegamalai' and 'Stenaelurillusneyyar' - from the Western Ghats region. Before the discovery of these new species of jumping spiders, 12 species of Phintella were known to be valid from India.

The Chief Minister said that air services are increasing gradually in the state under the regional connectivity scheme under the guidance of the Prime Minister. He informed Modi that 243 acres of land is being acquired for the expansion of Jolly Grant Airport in Dehradun. Besides, he said feasibility survey has been done for expansion of Pantnagar airport.



# Activists dispute 'consent' claim for RRPL land acquisition

Sawant also appealed to the farmers from whom the state government acquired the land for the project not to allow the land to be used for RRPL> "You people (farmers) have not acquired this land. You have got this land from your ancestors. You are merev trustees of the land. This land has taken care of your earlier generations. You will be earning your livelihood doing farming on this land. In fact, you have to protect your land and nature in our area for future generations. My request to you is: learn from your mistakes, get united and fight for the cause".

The development came on day the Maharashtra Industries Minister Uday Samant reiterated that the State

Government would not go ahead with the RRPL without the consent of the affected farmers in the six villages surrounding the project site.

In a statement made a day after he called on NCP chief Sharad Pawar and other party leaders to brief them about the state government's stand on the RRPL, Samant said: "Yesterday, representatives of the locals who are protesting against the RRPL met Pawar, and later CM Shinde separately. I conveyed a clear message that the project will not be taken up without the consent and co-operation of the local people". It may be recalled that on

April 12, 2018, an Indian consortium comprising Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan

Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) signed Memorandum Understanding (MoU) with Saudi Arabian Oil Co (Saudi Aramco) for setting an oil refinery and petroleum products complex in Rajapur taluka of Ratnagiri district.

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After the then ruling Shiv Sena which ruled the state along with BJP, opposed the location of the project at Nanar in Ratnagiri, then chief minister Uddahv Thackeray had written to the Centre for locating the project at Barsu, a request that the Narendra Modi government accepted.

Meanwhile, the affected villagers who had suspended their on-going agitation for three days on April 28 are likely to resume their agitation in the coming days.

The seemingly mass migration took place in Malda days ahead of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's visit to this Muslim-dominated North Bengal district.

Malda District TMC secretary Md Hosamuddin joined the Congress along with a thousand party members alleging rampant corruption and what he called "cut money raj."

"People like us had been with the Congress since the days of ABA Ghani Khan Chowdhury. Subsequently we joined the TMC inspired by Mamata Banerjee's sacrifices ... but of late there has been a massive degeneration in the TMC ... though the top lead-ership speaks of 'zero tolerance to corruption' here the leaders are sunk neck-deep in it ... there is cut-money raj everywhere ... posts are sold in lieu of money ... the people are very angry with the ministers and MLAs who are going to jail



on charges of corruption ... so I along with many of my party men have decided to join the Congress," Hosamuddin said adding many more leaders would soon switch sides.

Malda borders another Muslim dominated district of Murshidabad that recently saw a Left-supported Congress candidate winning the Sagardighi Assembly by-elections defeating the ruling party by a whopping 27,000 votes.

IIT-M researchers develop ML tool for better detection of brain tumours

Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras have developed a Machine Learning (ML)-based computational tool for better detection of cancercausing tumours in the brain and spinal cord such as Glioblastoma.

Their findings were published in the peer-reviewed journal Briefings **Bioinformatics**.

The tool called aGBMDriver' (GlioBlastoma Mutiforme Drivers), was developed specifically to identify driver mutations and passen ger mutations in glioblastoma. The tool is publicly available online.

"We have identified the important amino acid features for identifying cancer-causing mutations and achieved the highest accuracy for distinguishing between driver and neutral mutations," said Prof. M. Michael Gromiha, Department of Biotechnology at IIT Madras, in a statement.

We hope that this tool (GBMDriver) could help to prioritise driver mutations in glioblastoma and assist in identifying potential therapeutic targets, thus helping to develop drug design strategies," Gromiha added.

The Election Commission on Monday l ordered enhanced vigil at 185 checkposts on Karnataka's border with six neighbouring states to prevent any unauthorised movement of inducements such as cash, liquor, freebies and drugs ahead of the May 10 assembly polls.

The Election Commission, led by Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar, held a virtual meet with top officials of Karnataka, its neighbouring states of Goa, Maharashtra, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Kerala as well as representatives of central agen-cies to review the election arrangements and law and order coordination.

Chief secretaries, police chiefs and nodal police officers of Karnataka and the six neighbouring states and nodal officers of central forces and senior officials from enforcement agencies such as Coast Guard and Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) attended the meeting.

The poll panel directed state teams to enhance vigilance on the state border. CEC Kumar specifically emphasised on the need for vigil at the 185 inter-state checkposts to ensure that no cross-border movement of illicit cash, liquor, drugs, freebies takes place.

While taking note of seizure of more than Rs 305 crore till date as compared to Rs 83 crore in the last assembly elections, Kumar said there was a need to fix responsibility of local officers failing to control money power. The CEC asked the officials to step up the seizures with support from adjoining border states and instill fear of administration amongst the violators to ensure inducement-free election.

He also directed Coast Guard and Narcotics Control Bureau officials to keep strict vigil and help curtail the menace of drugs. The CEC also directed officials to keep a strict watch over social media for any violations and fake narratives aimed at vitiating the election atmosphere. He urged the officials to raise the bar further on voter turnout.

Election Commissioner Anup Chandra Pandey sought strict action against anti-social elements, follow-up of pending non-bailable warrants and strict vigil during the "silence period" -- 48 hours before the end of polling -- to ensure elections without fear and favour. Election Commissioner Arun Goel asked the officials to tighten vigilance without causing inconvenience to the public and ensure a thorough follow-up post seizure operations.

He noted that the objective of the review was

## **Gross neglect**

11 people die in Ludhiana because some unscrupulous people released toxic waste into drains

he death of 11 people, including three children, in the Giaspura of Ludhiana has once highlighted the issue of industrial effluents. Local officials suspect that toxic waste was illegally released in the sewer which resulted in noxious fumes that were responsible for the mishap. Four persons have been hospitalised. The residents have been evacuated; a National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) team has reached the spot. These, however, are all firefighting measures; the real problem is much bigger. It may not be difficult to find the culprits of the Giaspura leak. "Several dyeing units and other factories are located in Giaspura. Over the past few years, discharge of chemical waste from factories has emerged as an illegal business. This happens mostly on weekends," an official told a newspaper. The question is: what did the official do about it? According to the newspaper report, local councilor Jaspal Singh Giaspura



said he was aware of effluents from factories being dumped into sewers by a gang and claimed to have taken up the issue with the municipal corporation, former chief minister Amarinder Singh and the Pollution Control Board on several occasions. What did all of them do? All the politicians, bureaucrats and efforts were not even properly reactive, let alone being proactive in the matters related to their duty. And now that some people have died and others hospitalised, the Punjab Government announced Rs 2-lakh ex-gratia payment to the kin of the deceased and Rs 50,000 each to those under treatment. Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has also announced similar payments, as the victims were from his state.

Those who were running the illegal business of dumping untreated industrial waste into drains may be apprehended and thrown behind bars, but the real issue of proper disposal of industrial effluents cannot be addressed. In November last year, National Green Tribunal (NGT) chairperson AK Goel had slammed the seven states through which river Ganga flows. He pointed out that the Centre had allocated Rs 25,000 crore under the Mission for Clean Ganga, but none of these state governments had so far taken any concrete steps to stop the flow of dirty water and industrial discharge into the Ganges. Given the condition of the Ganga and drains in our cities, it is unlikely that the situation has improved in the last six months. A study conducted by The Energy Resources Institute, conducted a year ago, found that the sources of toxic heavy metals in the Yamuna in Delhi region were primarily manmade, the result of industrial waste. Again, there is little improvement in the river water. The situation is similar in other parts of the country. The root-cause is the absence of interest on the part of politicians to clean the environment and make life better for people. They are busy with their own agendas and games. People have to leave to their own devices. Like the people of Giaspura in Ludhiana.



# **Train IAS officers** for selfless-service



Vision and values should be the core of the bureaucracy. It is essential to infuse the mission values into the training process of young officers

ision-oriented, mission-driven and value-based successful institutions to sustain growth and enhance performances focus on vision, mission and value alignment for recruiting and training the employees for the institution. The basic reason is that when employees feel connected to one organization's vision, mission and values at the very outset, it inspires the zeal in them to come out with the manifested best. The mission, vision and value statement constitute the unique identity of the institution and it is essential to infuse the mission values into the training process.

Demand for new talents and search to fill up vacancies on an urgent basis sometimes require quick filling of skill gaps, prompting the hiring process to focus more on candidates' skills rather than on mission and value alignment. Though the filling skill gap is important; ensuring mission and value alignment is critical and essential. Because lack of it causes a wane in the contribution of the employees and affects the system's performance. An employee to be positive, proactive, committed and creative in problemsolving, should be aligned with the mission and value of the system from the very beginning.

This being a concept very pragmatic and adaptable, it is to be discerned as to how far we can adopt the same for the training of civil servants. (The rejigging in the recruitment process as required would be dealt with separately in another article of mine). After a really rigorous, cumbersome and year-long process of recruitment, when civil servants (A.I.S and also allied service officers) come out successful and triumphant, what they really need is proper training (vision, mission and value-aligned) to serve and render their best for the service of the nation by becoming positive, pro-poor, pro-people and pro-active officers to take the trajectory of growth of the nation in the right direction and with right

cultivate an esprit de corps' without which the service has no meaning. He further expressed that 'impartiality and incorruptibility in administration must be maintained so as to work without fear or favour or without any expectation of extraneous rewards. His advice was to adopt the democratic way of administration (to be pro-people) and uphold the values like dignity, integrity and incorruptibil-

The vision of Sardar Patel was that 'Civil Servants should work with dignity, integrity and honesty so as to serve people of the nation'. The civil servants while adopting the democratic way of administration should maintain discipline and uphold the values like integrity and incorruptibility. The mission as stated was to do the service of the nation without fear or favour.

The value statement as was clear can be encoded that civil servants should adopt democratic ways of administration (to treat the common man as their own meaning to be pro-poor, pro-people), maintain discipline, uphold dignity, integrity and incorruptibility, maintain impartiality in administration and to work without fear or favour or

any expectation of reward.

The vision and mission statements mentioned here are not mere succinct sentences portraying the purpose of the creation of a strong bureaucracy. It reflects the core value and the identity mark of the service and the basic expectation from the civil service so as to serve the country selflessly. It reflected both the vision and mission of the civil service. The mission as pronounced by Sardar Patel was clear, attainable, inspiring and pragmatic.

SARDAR PATEL David Naylor stated 'value-based recruitment (also WAS THAT 'CIVIL training) serves as a new SERVANTS dimension'. ## Melting glaciers: Playing spoil sport

Rapidly melting glaciers, climate change loom as a huge threat to ice hockey in Ladakh

t an elevation of over 3,000 meters above sea Alevel, Ladakh is an ideal place for the region's favourite winter sport - ice hockey. The sport was started in eastern Ladakh around 50 years ago by the Indian Army as a downtime game for army men. Over the years, the sport gained popularity among the locals so much so that their relationship with the game has become natural now. Children growing up in Ladakh have many fond memories of holidays where playing on ice has been a key part of their winter activity routine.Ice hockey has grown by leaps and bounds and it has become one of the most popular sports among Ladakhi youth.

The women of Ladakh equally enjoy this sport. Today, there are more than 20 ice hockey teams in Ladakh including both men and women. Popular winter tournaments are hosted every season such as the LG (lieutenant governor) Cup and the CEC (chief executive councillor) Cup, where teams from various parts of Ladakh participate and proper gear is provided to the players. In started playing, we would get



February this year, a national championship was held as well. The Indian women's team for ice hockey is an all-Ladakhi women's team that has proudly been representing India at various international matches since 2016. However, with rapidly melting glaciers, climate change looms as a huge threat to this popular sport. Hockey player Deskit, a member of the Ladakh Women Ice Hockey Foundation says, "I am among the first generation of women hockey players in

Ladakh. I've been playing defence in the national team since 2016. Since we don't have a proper artificial ice hockey rink, we are completely dependent on the frozen ponds. And now, climate change has created a greater problem for us. When I had

at least 3-4 months to play in the winter, but now, even in this cold area, winter arrives late and finishes early and so we get only two months of play."Over the last few decades, scientists have recorded a retreat in both snowfall and glacial mass in Ladakh.

With the receding glaciers and greater influx of tourists, Ladakh's native people are facing issues in every space. "Throughout the year, we only get the winter season to practice and compete for international championships unlike other overseas teams that have year-round facilities. This really impacts our training and performance," Deskit adds.Deskitshares that they have been promised an artificial ice hockey rink in Ladakh. "If it is not built and the impact of climate change continues at the current pace, we might lose this much-

loved winter sport," she rues. For the past few years, match-es are being held at the NDS ice hockey rink at Leh which was built looking at the rising interest and potential of this sport in the mountainous terrain. But, the complete infrastructural development

of the ice rink still remains pending. Prior to this rink, matches were usually held at the natural ice pond at Karzoo. The players practice at such naturally formed ice ponds.As the threat of global warming puts practising natural ice ponds at risk, the demand for more artificial

rinks has gone up. According to a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration report, the temperature of the earth has risen by an average of 0.08 degrees Celsius per decade since 1880 and the 10 warmest years in recorded history have all occurred since 2010.

While climate change has been taking place since time immemorial, the pace at which its happening is not giving us time to adapt to this change. If we look at the issue and its impact from a holistic perspective, it cannot be denied that ice hockey holds a prominent place in the life of Ladakh and efforts need to be put in to sustain the sport, especially this one that is a version of India's national sport

There are 12 suspicious transactions under investigation, it was SEBI's responsibility that these transactions should not have happened. How did you do then? The Supreme Court in its order asked SEBI to investigate whether Adani Group had violated Rule 19A of the Securities Contracts (Regulation) Rules, 1957. And have the share prices been manipulated in violation of laws? For this, 60 days were given. But SEBI needs another six months. On January 24, 2023, the report of America's forensic financial company Hindenburg came out, in which serious allegations of corruption were levelled against Adani Group. Also, 88 questions were asked from the Adani group. The Supreme Court should also have raised these questions.



# Rejecting evolution is a horrible mistake

Several scientists and educators are protesting against the exclusion of Evolution Theory from curriculum



istory indeed repeats first as tragedy and then as farce, as Marx had said. In 2017, the fundamentalist state of Turkey under President Recep Tayyip Erdogan removed Darwin's Theory of Evolution from the school curriculum because it was a "controversial subject", "above the students' level and not directly relevant." It was a tragedy for the Turkish state founded by Mustafa Kemal Ataturk, who had combined Islamism and political pluralism to make Turkey a model democracy in the Islamic world. Saudi Arabia is the only other country to exclude evolutionary theory from the school curriculum. Both Christian and Muslim creationists reject the theory of evolution. "The forces of darkness and ignorance are never permanently defeated", the celebrated scientist and science-writer Asimov noted. Even in the USA, powerful evangelist groups have succeeded in banning evolution in some states and local schools. In 1925, a high school biology teacher named John Thomas Scopes was fined a hundred dollars by a court in Tennessee for teaching that humans had evolved from lower forms of life, against a law passed by the Tennesse legislature forbidding teachers in publicly supported schools to teach evolution. Even now, equal time has to be given for teaching evolution and creationism in many of the publicly funded schools in the USA. But it was unthinkable that such a thing could ever happen in India, known for its prowess in science and technology that has propelled the country, once called the "Sick Man of Asia", to the fifth largest economy in the world. But history never ceases to spring surprises. It is indeed a farce that in the pretext of rationalising the curriculum and reducing the load on students, NCERT has now removed the Theory of Evolution from the Class IX-X curriculum. According to a document released by NCERT, Chapter: 9 'Heredity and Evolution' has been replaced with 'Heredity'. Among the list of other dropped chapters are Charles Robert Darwin, Origin of Life on Earth, Molecular Phylogeny, Evolution, Tracing Evolutionary Relationships and Human Evolution.

and educators from TIFR, IISc, IISER, IITs, and many other institutions have signed an open letter - 'An Appeal Against Exclusion of Evolution from Curriculum' protesting against the move. They demanded that the theory of Darwinian evolution in particular be restored in secondary education. The letter rightly stated, "In the current educational structure, only a small fraction of students chooses the science stream in grade XI or XII, and an even smaller fraction of those choose biology as one of the subjects of study. learning; their impact goes far deeper in shaping the future of a country because textbooks determine how young minds are to be moulded for the benefit of society. It will be dangerous to allow young minds to be shaped according to the ideology of any ruling party. Evolution is often decried by the Hindutva fundamentalists who contend that we had descended from Rishis and Munis and certainly not from lowly apes. The ignorance runs so deep that even a minister, and that too of human resources, had said in 2018 that the theory of evolution was 'scientifically wrong' because "no one has ever seen a monkey turn into a man."

The present government's inten-tion and attitude towards science are becoming intriguingly suspect. Very recently, it has come out with a notification for winding up Vigyan Prasar, an autonomous institution under the Department of Science & Technology (DST) whose brief includes the popularisation of science and promoting scientific tem-per in the country. It is a unique institution in India with no parallel, within the government or outside, an institution that has been working quietly since 1989 when it was set up, to popularise science and to disseminate scientific knowledge through print and electronic media, books, journals and newsletters and films, and also through workshops and events conducted all over the country, with the help of a skeletal staff of only 10 scientists and some 25 administrative staff, on a scanty budget only Rs 14 crore a year for all its activities including establishment costs. During its short span of existence, what it has produced will be the envy of any organisation: it has published 400 books by renowned scientists and science writers, produced over 3000 radio science programmes in 19 languages and 12 dialects and made more than 5000

films on popular science. It publishes a monthly bilingual journal called Dream 2047 in English and Hindi, with outreach to almost every government school in the country, besides 10 other monthly newsletters in Assamese, Bengali, Tamil, Kannada, Telugu, Maithili, Urdu, Kashmiri and Punjabi. It runs "India Science", an internet-based 24X7 OTT channel telecast by Door Darshan and Sansad TV that remains the only source of scientific information for most of our students and rural folks to learn about science in layman's language.

The decision to wind up such an exemplary and lean organisation, an apolitical and neutral space for promoting science and scientific temper that the country needs so badly has been shocking, to say the least, and might spell the end of science popularisation in the country, despite the government's pretensions to the contrary. It is supposedly being done for evolving a "new communication structure" to replace Vigyan Prasar, no details of which have been spelt out, because probably there is none. It is inconceivable that the DST will have the capacity to carry out these tasks in any case, science communication is not a bureaucratic job, it requires specialised skills to take science to the people. It also requires a commitment and a missionary zeal that bureaucrats are hardly likely to possess. After all, why close down an efficient organisation that has been serving its purpose so well unless there is some other motive? Is this the way to promote science in a country that is still steeped in deep-seated superstitions and irrational beliefs, practices and attitudes, even among the so-called educated? The prime minister has always been forthright and rational in his views on science. The rest of the officialdom must come clean on the government's policies on science

"The Seventh Commandment comes to mind: If you steal something you have to give it back," Francis said during an airborne press conference en route home from Hungary.

Recently, Francis returned to Greece the three fragments of the Parthenon sculptures that had been in the Vatican Museums' collection for two centuries. The pope said on Sunday that the restitution was "the right gesture" and that when such returns were possible, museums should undertake them.

"In the case where you can return things, where it's necessary to make a gesture, better to do it," he said. "Sometimes you can't, if there are no possibili-



ties — political, real or concrete possibilities. But in the cases where you can restitute, please do it. It's good for everyone, so you don't get used to putting your hands in someone else's pockets." His comments to The Associated Press were his first on a question that has forced many museums in Europe and North America to rethink their ethnographic and anthropological collections.

The restitution debate has gathered steam amid a reckoning for the colonial conquests of Africa, the Americas, and Asia and demands for restitution of war loot by the countries and communities of origin.

The Vatican has an exten sive collection of artefacts and art made by Indigenous peoples from around the world, much of it sent to Rome by Catholic missionaries for a 1925 exhibition in the Vatican gardens. The Vatican insists the artefacts, including ceremonial masks, wampum belts and feathered headdresses, were gifts. But Indigenous scholars dispute whether Native peoples at the time could have freely offered their handicrafts given the power differentials at play in colonial periods.

Francis, the first-ever Latin American pope, knows the history well. Last year, he travelled to Canada to personally apologize to Indigenous peoples for abuses they endured at the hands of Catholic missionaries at residential schools.

In the run-up to the visit, Indigenous groups visited the Vatican's Anima Mundi museum, saw some of their ancestors' handiwork, and expressed interest in having greater access to the collection, and the return of some items.

hina has maintained its stance Con the UN Security Council reforms, saying there should be more representation for develop-ing countries, especially the small and medium countries, but avoided a direct response to India and other countries' call for its expansion and their inclusion.

Wang Yi, director of the Office of the Foreign Affairs Commission of the Communist Party of China (CPC) Central Committee met Tareq M A M Albanai and Alexander Marschik, co-chairs of Intergovernmental the Negotiations (IGN) on UNSC reforms, in Beijing on Saturday and outlined China's stand on the reorganisation of the top organ of the world body.

China is one of the five vetowielding members of the 15-member UNSC along with France, Russia, the UK and the US.

The remaining 10 members are elected as non-permanent members for two-year terms and do not have veto powers.

India has been at the forefront of the years-long efforts to reform the Security Council, saying it rightly deserved a place as a permanent member of the United Nations



In his interactions with the IGN representatives, Wang said in the reform of the Security Council, efforts should be made to uphold fairness and justice, increase the representation and voice of developing countries, give more small and medium-sized countries the opportunity to participate in decision-making and correct historical injustices against Africa in particular.

It is hoped that the co-chairs will guide all parties to remove disturbances and build consensus so that the reform process of the Security Council will be widely recognised by the international community and the results will stand the test of history, state-run Xinhua news agency quoted Wang as saving.

On April 25, India's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador Ruchira Kamboj while speaking at the UNSC said India is right in demanding a major course correction of the UN's top body when the world's

largest democracy is kept out of the global decision-making. Kamboj questioned whether the international community can practise "multilateralism effectively" in the 21st century through a body that celebrates the principle "to the victor belong the spoils" privileged more than three generations ago.

How much longer will we keep decorating effective multilateralism with the intent of reforming multilateralism with only words and mere lip service? she asked China has been maintaining a vague stand on the UNSC reforms


dismissed a petition seeking ownership over legendary Bollywood actor Raj Kapoor's Haveli in the historic walled city here in the capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, which has been declared a national heritage by the provincial government in 2016.

A two-member bench of the Peshawar High Court comprising Justices Ishtiaq Ibrahim and Abdul Shakoor on Thursday dismissed the ownership case of the petitioner. The court dismissed the petition in light of an earlier judgment of the same court pertaining to the acquisition process of legendary actor Dilip Kumar's haveli in Peshawar's famous Qissa Khwani Bazaar, which had already been declared a national heritage by the federal government led by the then prime minister Nawaz Sharif.

The Additional Advocate General of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province told the court that the provincial archaeology department had declared the Kapoor Haveli a national heritage in 2016 through a notification.

On this point, Justice Shakoor asked the archaeology department whether they had any documents or proof that indicated that the Raj Kapoor family ever lived in the haveli.

Advocate Sabahauddin Khattak, the counsel for the petitioner, Saeed Muhammad, told the court that the father of the petitioner had purchased the mansion during an auction in 1969 after competitive bidding, paid its cost and remained as absolute owner till the commencement of the acquisition process initiated by the provincial government. He further claimed that there are no



documents with any department of the provincial government to prove that the late Raj Kapoor and his family ever lived or owned this property.

However, the bench told the counsel that the matter ought to be taken to a civil court.

The mansion is now in a very dilapidated condition and its current owners want to demolish the structure and construct a commercial plaza in view of its prime location. However, all such moves were stopped as the archaeology department wanted to preserve the mansion, eeping in view its historic importance.

Raj Kapoor's ancestral home, known as Kapoor Haveli, is situated in Peshawar's famous Qissa Khwani Bazaar. It was built between 1918 and 1922 by the legendary actor's grandfather Dewan Basheswarnath Kapoor. Raj Kapoor and his uncle Trilok Kapoor were born here.

Ankara(AP): Turkish forces have killed the leader of the Islamic State group during an operation in Syria, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan said late Sunday.

Recep Tayyip Erdogan told TRT Turk television in an interview that the IS leader, code-named Abu Hussein al-Ouravshi, was killed in a strike conducted on Saturday.

Erdogan said the Turkish intelligence agency, MIT, had been following him "for a long time.

"We will continue our struggle against terrorist organisations without discriminating against any of them," Erdogan said in the interview.

In FY23, the airport, which has three terminals now, han-dled around 65.33 million passengers, including 15.65 million international passengers. Phase 3A expansion work

is going on at the Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA), which is operated by Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL). "Post completion of Phase

3A expansion work scheduled in 2023, Delhi airport will become the only Indian airport whose terminals would be able to handle 100 million passengers per annum (MPPA)," it said in a release. The airport offers connectivity with more than 142 domestic and international destinations.

During April 2022 to February 2023 period, the airport handled more than 14.50 million transfer passengers



(hub traffic), including more than 3.37 lakh who were international to international transfer passengers.

Currently, 63 airlines operate out of Delhi airport.

"Nearly 70 per cent of Indian airports fall under Delhi's catchment area, which is a good mix of industrial and tourist destinations and can be reached by air within 60-90

minutes. "Delhi airport is a dominant airport in the North and North East region. It also provides seamless connectivity between Bhutan, Nepal, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, and the rest of the world," the release said.

Meanwhile, the government is working on plans to make Delhi an international aviation hub.

"The government has asked Delhi airport and some of the major airlines to examine the global best practices on scheduling to ensure that international and domestic operations complement each other and provide enhanced connectivity from Delhi airport, essential for setting up India's first international aviation hubs," the release said.

Worried over the low recovery rate from written-off accounts, the Finance Ministry has asked state-owned lenders to increase it to about 40 per cent, sources said.

Currently, the recovery rate from written-off accounts is less than 15 per cent. Public sector banks (PSBs) could recover only 14 per cent of the written-off loans worth Rs 7.34 lakh crore in the last five years ended March 2022.

Of Rs 7.34 lakh crore written-off loans, state-owned lenders recovered Rs 1.03 lakh crore. So after recovery, the net written-off stood at Rs 6.31 lakh crore at the end of March 2022.

It seems that after the write off banks get complacent about recovery from those non-performing assets (NPAs), the sources said, adding, this level of recovery is not acceptable.

Besides, they said, higher recovery from written-off accounts directly adds to their bottomline and improves their capital. To review the situation on the issue, the sources said, the Department of Financial Services would soon hold a meeting with senior officials of PSBs.

The proposed meeting would take stock of pending cases with regard to such accounts in various courts, including Debt Recovery Tribunal and Debt Recovery Appellate Tribunal.

## Large corporates will never be allowed to open a bank in India'

MUMBAI: Large corporates will never be allowed to open a bank in India, veteran banker N Vaghul has said.

Vaghul said India has learnt from its pre-bank nationalisation experience and will never repeat the same mistakes by allowing large corporations into banking.

In the last round of licensing before it was made on-tap, a slew of corporates had unsuccessfully applied for a banking license

Two years ago, a RBI discussion paper made a case for allowing the large corporations because of their ability to get capiwhich will in turn fund economic growth. tal

That discussion led to a raft of criticism by many, including former RBI top brass, and did not move ahead.

Speaking to reporters, Vaghul suggested that the capital needed for economic growth will come from the public, which is keen to invest in a lender which is run professionally. Industrial houses "cannot be banking", Vaghul said, recall-

ing the past experiences with them and how state ownership of banks became popular.

"There used to be a talk about, even in professional banking circles, that things are not alright in the banks which are owned by the industrial houses.

"I don't think this country will have a repetition of that. It will be all professional banking," he told reporters on the sidelines of the launch of "Reflections", his memoirs, last Friday. PTI

The seasonally adjusted S&P Global Índia Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) increased from 56.4 in March to 57.2 in April, indicating the fastest improvement in the health of the sector so far this year.

The March PMI data pointed to an improvement in overall operating conditions for the 22nd straight month. In PMI parlance, a print above 50 means expansion while a score below 50 indicates contraction. "Reflecting a robust and quicker expansion in new orders, production growth took another step forward in April. Companies also benefitted from relatively mild price pressures, better international sales, and improving supply-chain conditions," Pollyanna De Lima, Economics Associate Director at S&P Global Market Intelligence, said.

Factory orders and production rose at the strongest rates in 2023 so far, more jobs were created and companies stepped up input purchasing, owing to stock-replenishment efforts.

"It seems like Indian manufacturers have abundant opportunities to keep powering ahead. Besides seeing the strongest inflow of new work in 2023 so far, capacities were expanded through job creation, input buying was lifted and preproduction inventories rose at a record rate," Lima said. New orders placed with goods producers rose at the quickest pace since last December. According to panel members, the upturn was supported by favourable market conditions, demand strength, and publicity.

## India's fuel sales rise in April as agri demand picks up

New Delhi (PTI): India's fuel sales rose in April as diesel demand grew on the back of a pick up in harvesting of Rabi crops and expansion of economic activity, preliminary industry data showed on Monday.

Demand for diesel, the most consumed fuel in the country accounting for about two-fifths of the demand, soared 6.7 per cent to 7.15 million tonnes in April compared to a year ago period.

Month-on-month sales rose 4.8 per cent when compared with 6.83 million tonnes of diesel consumed in March which witnessed a seasonal slowdown.

### ACC has not floated any proposal to postpone Asia Cup: Source

ontradicting media reports that Asia Cup could be postponed and a parallel tournament, excluding Pakistan, could be played in Dubai in the same window, the Asian Cricket Council (ACC) sources on Monday said that they have not sent out any

such proposal to the member nations. A report in Pakistan media claimed that if PCB will not agree to play Asia Cup at a neutral venue, the tournament could be taken away from the country.

The hosting rights of the 2023 Asia Cup, scheduled to be held in ODI format, are with the Pakistan Cricket Board but BCCI secretary Jay

Shah, who is also the ACC chairman, has made it clear that the Indian cricket team will not travel to Pakistan.

The PCB has proposed to host Asia Cup on a 'hybrid model', where Pakistan play their matches on the home soil, while India play at a neu-tral venue -- in all likelihood Dubai.

It is understood that the BCCI wants the entire tournament to be shifted to the UAE -- which has three grounds in Dubai, Sharjah and Abu Dhabi -- much like the 2018 and 2022 editions when India and Sri Lanka were the tournament hosts.

"There has been exchange of messages but no discussion or proposal to postpone the Asia Cup has

been floated," an ACC Board member, privy to discussions on the sidelines of an ICC meet in Dubai, told PTI on the conditions of anonymity.

"Secondly, if the Asia Cup is cancelled, PCB will be intimated first. Nothing of that sort has happened till now. The ACC chairman (Shah) hasn't yet put anything on record.

'To postpone or cancel the event, the ACC will have to call an Executive Board meeting. The chairman (Shah) can call the meeting in seven days (virtual or physical). To date, there is no intimation about any such meeting," the source added.

The ACC source said that, to the best of his knowledge, the last official mail exchange between the PCB,



ACC and BCCI was an invitation sent to the Indian team with assurance of highest degree of security and best hospitality.

"But, obviously, it is difficult for India to travel to Pakistan in the current sensitive political environment," he agreed.

The other issue is amount of money the official broadcaster has committed on telecast deals, that includes at least two assured India-Pakistan games. If the two teams make the final, the third game would be a bonanza.

'We must remember the media rights and the agreement with Star Sports, who have paid millions for, at least, two Pakistan

vs India matches in the Asia Cup, he said. It is learnt that when the infor-

mal discussion was held between the ACC members about hosting the tournament at neutral venue, the source confirmed that BCCI did get support from Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC).

"Look, if Asia Cup is cancelled after the ACC chairman summons an Executive Board meeting, the ramifications will not just be Pakistan's World Cup participation but also PCB's FTP calendar and bilateral relations with Sri Lanka, Afghanistan or Bangladesh.

"The situation is still very fluid," the source said.




