MURDER MOST FOUL ROCKS DELHI AGAIN

Girl stabbed 20 times with knife, bludgeoned in full public view in Shahbad Dairy; killer arrested

In a horrific murder that shook the national Capital a 16-year-old girl was stabbed over 20 times and then stoned to death in full public view in Shahbad Dairy area late on Sunday night. The accused has been arrested from Bulandshahr, in Uttar Pradesh. Identified as Sahil the 20-year-old works as a fridge and AC mechanic. The horrific attack lasted for 90 seconds and this includes him kicking her body. The accused is seen walking away from victim in a casual manner only to turn back and again hit her with cement slab before leaving site.

point the knife got stuck in the head of the victim. The accused then picked up a heavy cement slab lying nearby and started hitting her. Shockingly, the murder took place in full view of people who can be seen passing within inches of the attacker, but no one stops or says anything as the girl falls to the ground and the attacker continues his assault. AAP lashes out at LG, BJP screams 'Love Jihad'

A political slugfest erupted between the AAP and the BJP on Monday following the gruesome killing of a 16-year-old girl allegedly by her boyfriend in Shahbad Dairy area. While AAP convener and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal sought to corner Lieutenant-Governor VK Saxena over the poor law and order situation in the national Capital, the Delhi BJP termed the

brutal killing an incident of 'Love Jihad' and compared it with the Shraद्धa Walker murder case. Taking to Twitter, Kejriwal wrote, "A minor girl was brutally murdered in Delhi. This is very sad and unfortunate. The criminals have become fearless, there is no fear of the police. LG sir, law and order is your responsibility, do something. The safety of the people of Delhi is of paramount importance". Kejriwal's comment on Delhi LG comes in the back-

drop of the row over Centre's ordinance which limited the Delhi Government's powers. BJP MP Hans Raj Hans termed the brutal killing of a minor girl in northwest Delhi "very painful" and said youths sometimes get "carried away by emotions" and act like "fools". Hans who, along with local BJP leaders, met the family of the victim, said the "strictest" punishment should be given to the guilty in the murder of the girl in his constituen-

cy. He said it was a "very painful" incident that came to his knowledge on Sunday night and since then he was in touch with the police for quick action to arrest the accused. The Delhi BJP claimed the gruesome murder was a case of 'love jihad', and slammed the AAP for "trying to portray" it as an "ordinary" murder and a "law and order" issue.

Don't support AAP on ordinance: Cong men

Kharge told by Delhi, Punjab Cong leaders

Days after Delhi Chief Minister and AAP convener Arvind Kejriwal sought an appointment with Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and senior leader Rahul Gandhi to rally their support in his party's fight against the Modi Government's ordinance and defeat it in the Rajya Sabha, the Congress units of Delhi and Punjab on Monday bluntly told the party leadership to maintain distance from the AAP.

The leaders from Delhi and Punjab have advised the party leadership not to speak about the Centre's ordinance on control of services in the national Capital and not have any alliance with Kejriwal, who is mustering support from the Opposition to oppose the ordinance.

Kharge had convened a meeting of leaders from Delhi and Punjab to seek their opinion on the matter. Former Congress president Rahul was also present during the meeting. The leaders from Delhi and Punjab met the leadership separately. During the meeting, Delhi Congress leaders suggested that they should not have any alliance with the AAP.

Reportedly several leaders from the Congress told the leadership to not support Kejriwal, calling his party the "B-team" of the BJP and claiming he harmed the Congress' interests not only in Delhi and Punjab but other States as well. The Congress leaders further

advised the party leadership that either the party should remain silent or should not support Kejriwal on the ordinance issue. However, the leaders have left it to the High Command to take a final decision.

Congress leaders Ajay Maken, Arvinder Singh Lovely, Harun Yusuf, Delhi Congress president Anil Chaudhary attended the meeting, with Kharge and Rahul and shared their viewpoints on the issue. During the meeting, Delhi Congress explained to the party leadership why they should not support Kejriwal. Similar sentiments were expressed by Punjab leaders led by State unit chief Amarinder Singh Raja Warring, sources said.

The Congress leadership will also meet party leaders from other States before deciding its position. After the meeting, Punjab Congress president Warring said they have put across their views before the party High Command and left the final decision to it. "All the

leaders have said the party High Command will decide and we have left it to Kharge to take the final decision," Warring said. He later tweeted a resolution passed by Punjab leaders who came to Delhi against the AAP Government in Punjab for its action against a journalist.

Former party chief Navjot Sidhu said what transpired during the meeting was a secret and only the Congress chief or Rahul would divulge the details. He, however, said India's Constitution is a sacred 'granth' and he took inspiration from it.

Addressing the media at the party headquarters, Venugopal, who was also present in the meeting said, "Today we had discussions on this with Delhi and Punjab leadership.

They have given their concerns and views and certainly we will take a final call in the coming days." Asked if the party has decided on Kharge's meeting with Kejriwal on the latter's request, Venugopal said, "We will let you know once it's decided." **Continued on Page 2**

Gehlot, Pilot to fight Rajasthan elections unitedly, says Cong

Warring leaders agree to leave sticky issues to be resolved by High Command

Amid a festering leadership tussle in the Congress Rajasthan unit, the party on Monday said Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and his former deputy Sachin Pilot have agreed to fight the upcoming Assembly elections unitedly and have left all issues to be resolved by the party High Command.

Congress General Secretary KC Venugopal said in view of the upcoming Rajasthan Assembly election, party president Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi had a detailed four-hour-long discussion with Ashok Gehlot. Sachin Pilot joined the delib-



erations later which was held at Kharge's residence, he said. "In this discussion, we have decided to fight the election unitedly. Both are in agreement that the Congress party has to go together and definitely we will win the election in Rajasthan," he told reporters after the meeting.

"It is very clear that Rajasthan is going to be a strong State for the Congress party. We are going to win. Therefore, both the leaders Gehlot ji and Sachin ji have decided to go together. The Congress party will fight elections unitedly," Venugopal also said.

Welcome posters greet Shah in tense Manipur

Army rounds up 25 miscreants with arms; uneasy calm prevails as toll in Sunday's clashes touches five

Posters, banners and messages came up in Manipur on Monday welcoming Union Home Minister Amit Shah on his four-day visit during which he will meet stakeholders to assess the situation and take steps to restore normalcy to the State that witnessed ethnic violence over the past few weeks.

Shah's visit came on a day when the Indian Army and para-military forces rounded up at least 25 miscreants with arms, ammunition and grenades. A spokesperson for the defence forces said a num-



ber of people were detained with weapons after fresh incidents of firing and clashes broke out in and around Imphal valley on Sunday. "During operations in Sansabi, Gwalta, Shabunkhol, Khunao in Imphal East, Army apprehended 22 miscreants with weapons and other war like stores.

Five 12 bore double barrel rifles, three single barrel rifles, one country made weapon with double bore and one muzzle loaded weapon were recovered," he said in a statement. On Monday, an uneasy calm prevailed in Manipur, even as the death toll from Sunday's

clashes rose to five as three more people, who were undergoing treatment in hospitals, succumbed to their injuries, officials said.

Meanwhile, Union Minister Nisith Pramanik, who is the Minister of State for Home Affairs said in Guwahati that the Centre was providing all support to Manipur and the situation was "returning to normal". Pramanik's remarks came a few hours before Amit Shah began his four-day visit to the northeastern State.

Shah will hold several rounds of security meetings to assess the situation and plan steps to restore normalcy during his first visit to the State since the ethnic clashes between the Kuki and the Meitei communities broke out on May 3.

On Monday, posters and banners were seen in Imphal and several other districts. The welcome messages were issued by several civil society organisations of Manipur, sources said. **Continued on Page 2**

Nitish aide confirms Opp meet in Patna on June 12

Patna: A key aide of Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on Monday confirmed that the much-awaited meeting of Opposition parties is likely to be held in Patna on June 12. State Minister and senior JD(U) leader Vijay Kumar Chaudhary said most parties opposed to the BJP are likely to take part in the "extremely important meeting".

"It is now almost final that a meeting of most parties opposed to BJP will be held in Patna on June 12," he said. "Most Opposition parties share the belief that the BJP will not win the 2024 Lok Sabha elections if those opposed to it put up a united front," the JD(U) leader said.

"It is true that the initiative has been taken by our leader Nitish Kumar but we do not wish to claim any credit. Opposition unity is becoming a reality only because we are getting support from like-minded parties." **Continued on Page 2**

Wrestlers won't be allowed to protest at Jantar Mantar: Cops

Protesting grapplers yet to decide next course of action

A day after the Delhi Police cleared the sit-in site of the protesting wrestlers, the Delhi Police on Monday said they will be allowed to demonstrate at a suitable place in the city other than Jantar Mantar.

On the other hand, released late last night from police detention, the wrestlers are still contemplating their next move even as they continued to get support from sporting fraternity after police action against top grapplers was unequivocally condemned by political and sports personalities.

"The demonstration by the wrestlers was going on smoothly at the notified place of Jantar Mantar. On Sunday, the protesters flouted the law, ignoring



our repeated requests. Hence, we cleared the site and ended the dharna," Deputy Commissioner of Police (New Delhi) tweeted in Hindi. "If the wrestlers will apply for permission to stage their sit-in again in the future, they will be allowed to do so at any suitable notified place other than Jantar Mantar," it said.

Wrestlers Vinesh Phogat, Sakshi Malik and Bajrang Punia, along with other protesters, were booked for rioting and obstructing public servant in discharge of duty on Sunday after a scuffle with security personnel who tried to stop them from marching to the new Parliament building as it was being inaugurated. **Continued on Page 2**

CBI books RR, brass for graft in Hawk jet deal

The CBI has booked the British aerospace and defence major Rolls Royce PLC, its top executives and arms dealers in a graft case for alleged kickbacks in the procurement of Hawk 115 Advanced Jet Trainer aircraft for the Indian Air Force and Navy.

The CBI has registered a case against Tim Jones, Director Rolls Royce India, alleged arms dealers Sudhir Choudhrie and Bhanu Choudhrie, Rolls Royce Plc and British Aerospace Systems under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections 120-B

(criminal conspiracy) and 201 (destruction of evidence besides provisions of Prevention of Corruption Act following conclusion of a 2016 Preliminary Enquiry in the related matter.

A British court order in 2017 also mentioned the alleged involvement of middlemen and payment of commission by the company for swinging the deal, officials said. It is alleged that during 2003-12, these accused in conspiracy with unidentified public servants "abused their official positions" for procurement of 24 Hawk 115 AJTs for GBP 734.21 million.

Dhoni's team beats GT by 5 wickets in nail biting finish

In a nail biting finish, MS Dhoni-led Chennai Super Kings (CSK) won the IPL final and lifted the coveted title for the fifth time. They beat Gujarat Titans (GT) by five wickets in a 15 over second inning. The second innings of the IPL final between Gujarat Titans and Chennai Super Kings was on Monday affected by a strong passing shower here. Chasing 215 to win, CSK were 4/0 in 0.3 overs as the second innings began slightly late due to mid-innings show here at the Narendra Modi Stadium.

Earlier, B Sai Sudharsan struck a 47-ball 96 and missed his maiden IPL century, but did

UN talks on treaty to end global plastic pollution open in Paris

Even as India has decided to push for plastic recycling as "a means to spur a circular economy," a United Nations panel which met in Paris on Monday to work on what is intended to be a landmark treaty to bring an end to global plastic pollution, but there is almost no agreement yet on what the outcome should be.

The Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee for Plastics is entrusted with the task to develop the first international, legally binding treaty on plastic pollution, including in the marine environment.

This is the second of five meetings due to take place to complete the negotiations by the end of 2024.

At the first meeting, held six months ago in Uruguay, some countries pressed for global mandates, some for national solutions and others for both.

Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav, who has arrived in Paris, said India would be putting forth its experiences and lessons in tackling the plastic menace and push for recycling as "a means to spur a circular economy". **Continued on Page 2**

Joblessness dips to 6.8% in Q1 of FY 2023: NSSO

The unemployment rate for persons aged 15 years and above in urban areas declined to 6.8 per cent during January-March 2023 from 8.2 per cent a year ago, the National Sample Survey Survey (NSSO) showed. Joblessness or unemployment rate is defined as the percentage of unemployed persons in the labour force. Joblessness was high in January-March 2022, mainly due to the staggering impact of Covid-related restrictions in the country. The unemployment rate in July-September 2022 and October-December 2022 was 7.2 per cent only. It was 7.6 per cent in April-June 2022. The unemployment rate (UR) for persons aged 15 years and above in April-June 2022 was 7.6 per cent in urban areas, the 18th Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) showed.

In January-March 2022, the unemployment rate was 8.2 per cent. It also showed that the unemployment rate among females (aged 15 years and above) in urban areas declined to 9.2 per cent in January-March 2023 from 10.1 per cent in the same quarter a year ago. It was 9.6 per cent in October-December 2022, 9.4 per cent in July-September 2022 and 9.5 per cent in April-June 2022. Among males, the unemployment rate in urban areas dipped to six per cent in January-March 2023 compared to 7.7 per cent in the same quarter a year ago. It was 6.5 per cent in October-December 2022, 6.6 per cent in July-September 2022 and 7.1 per cent in April-June 2022. Labour force participation rate in CWS (Current Weekly Status) in urban areas for persons aged 15 years and above increased to 48.5 per

cent in the January-March quarter of 2023, from 47.3 per cent in the same period a year ago. It was 48.2 per cent in October-December 2022, 47.9 per cent in July-September 2022 and 47.5 per cent in April-June 2022. Labour force refers to the part of the population, which supplies or offers to supply labour for pursuing economic activities for the production of goods and services and, therefore, includes both employed and unemployed persons. NSSO launched PLFS in April 2017. On the basis of PLFS, a quarterly bulletin is brought out giving estimates of labour force indicators namely unemployment rate, Worker Population Ratio (WPR), Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR), distribution of workers by broad status in employment and industry of work in CWS.

6 Raj women among 8 killed as tractor trolley falls into gorge

Eight persons, including six women and two minors, were killed and 26 others were injured on Monday when a tractor trolley carrying them fell into a gorge in Rajasthan's Jhunjhunu district, police said. The incident took place in the evening when the victims were returning from a hilltop temple. Jhunjhunu Additional Superintendent of Police Tejpal Singh said that all the injured were admitted at different hospitals in Jhunjhunu and Sikar districts. Jhunjhunu collector Khushaal Yadav said that as per the latest information, a total of 34 victims were admitted to hospitals and of them, eight died. The deceased included six women and two minors while many of the survivors are men, he said.

LPG, PNG stoves with max thermal efficiency made

Public sector oil marketing major Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd. has developed LPG and PNG stoves with the highest thermal efficiency in the world. The LPG stoves have already been launched with 74 percent efficiency which is six to seven percent more efficiency than the traditional gas burners. If all the households adopt the Bharat Hi Stoves, the oil companies can save 1.7 million tonnes of LPG worth Rs 7,000 crores annually, Chief General Manager in-charge (R&D) of the Corporate R&D Centre, Ravi Kumar V said, adding, as many as 70,000 users have adopted these stoves. The BPCL has also developed an energy efficient PNG burner with 70 percent fuel efficiency as compared to the 55 percent efficiency of the traditional burners.

Mocking the 'Nau saal bemisaal' campaign of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi Government, Chaudhary said, "The past nine years have indeed been unparalleled. During this period the nation was led astray from the ideals of Mahatma Gandhi, whose statue was still unveiled abroad." The allusion was to the unveiling of a statue of Mahatma Gandhi in Hiroshima by Modi, who toured Japan recently. On the Sengol controversy, Chaudhary rubbished the Modi Government's claim that the sceptre was a symbol of the transfer of power. "Even if the claim were true, what would it have signified? No transfer of power was taking place yesterday", the JD(U) leader said, referring to the inauguration of the new Parliament building where the sceptre was installed close to the Speaker's chair. He also made light of the resignation from JD(U) of former Begusarai MP Monazir Hasan, who had on Sunday announced that he was giving up the party's primary membership. "Last year our party conducted a huge membership drive. But Hasan had refused to renew his membership. So he ceased to be a JD(U) member. I wonder what he is trying to achieve through the charade," Chaudhary added.

Kejriwal has reached out to several Opposition leaders over the past few weeks in a bid to drum up support for his cause. The AAP knows it lacks the numbers to defeat the ordinance in the Lok Sabha but received support from Bharat Rashtra Samithi formerly known as Telangana Rashtra Samithi (abbr. TRS), Trinamool Congress, Uddhav Thackeray's Shiv Senafaction, Sharad Pawar's Nationalist Congress Party. Kejriwal's 'reach-out' to the Congress was also rebuffed by ex-AAP leader Alka Lamba, who is now with the Congress. On news last week that the Delhi CM had sought time to meet Kharge, Rahul and other top figures, Lamba tweeted 'AAP should apologise (first)...In his bid to muster numbers to defeat the BJP and its allies, Kejriwal needs the Congress' 31 Rajya Sabha MPs; that of the Trinamool, the NCP and others on his side so far will fall short of the 93 lawmakers the BJP has on its own.

Gehlot, Pilot to fight Rajasthan elections...

The AICC general secretary, organisation, said both the leaders have left all issues relating to Rajasthan to be resolved by the party's High Command. Earlier, seeking to resolve the infighting in Rajasthan Congress, Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and his bete noire Sachin Pilot met party chief Mallikarjun Kharge here on Monday in the presence of Rahul Gandhi. Sources said Gehlot began his meeting with Kharge at his residence at around 6 PM, and was joined by Rahul Gandhi a few minutes later. The Congress chief and Gandhi held deliberations with Gehlot for about half an hour, after which the party's in-charge for Rajasthan Sukhjinder Randhawa was called in. Pilot, who has been attacking the Gehlot Government over the issue of inaction on corruption during the previous BJP Government led by Vasundhara Raje, joined the meeting after two hours at Kharge's residence. This is the first time after a long gap that the Rajasthan CM and his former deputy are meeting face to face in the presence of top party leadership. AICC general secretary KC Venugopal was also present at the meeting, the sources said. Kharge and

Gandhi are holding parleys with leaders of poll-bound States in order to evolve the party strategy for the Assembly elections to corner the BJP in these States. The party leadership is also working hard to resolve the infighting in the Rajasthan unit ahead of the Assembly polls and set at rest the differences between the two leaders. The Congress brass had already held discussions with top leaders from Madhya Pradesh in the morning, after which Gandhi said the party would win 150 seats in the State. Earlier, Gehlot said the party High Command is strong and it will never offer any position to any leader or worker to pacify him/her. The meeting comes close on the heels of Pilot's "ultimatum" that if three demands he made from the State Government were not met by the end of this month, he would launch a State-wide agitation. Pilot has asked for a high-level inquiry into the alleged scams that took place during the tenure of the former Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje Government, as one of his demands. Speaking to reporters earlier, Gehlot said there is no such tradition in the party to offer posts to any leader in order to

pacify him. "As far as I know, there is no such tradition in the Congress where any leader demands something and the party high command offers to give that position. We have not heard of such a formula ever," he said when asked about reports of a formula being worked out to rope in Pilot. Rubbishing such reports, he said it is only the creation of the media and some leaders may be getting such stories planted. "Never has such a thing happened in the Congress so far and neither will it happen in the future. The Congress party and the high command is very strong and no leader or worker has the courage to demand any position. It does not happen like that," the Chief Minister asserted. Gehlot and Pilot have been engaged in a power tussle since the Congress formed Government in the State in 2018. In 2020, Pilot led a failed revolt against the Gehlot government after which he was removed from the posts of party's state unit president and deputy chief minister. Pilot had last month defied a warning from the party and went ahead with a day-long fast targeting Gehlot over his "inaction" on corruption by the previous Raje Government in the State.

According to police, preliminary findings from the post-mortem indicate the girl was stabbed 16 times and her skull was crushed after it was bashed in by a blunt object. The detailed report has yet to be released. Police said the accused and the victim were in a "relationship" but had a quarrel on Saturday. The victim had gone shopping on Sunday evening for the birthday party of her friend's child when she was accosted by the accused in the densely populated neighbourhood, they said. The police suspect that continued "strained relationship" of the accused with the girl could be a possible reason behind the crime. Delhi Police PRO Suman Nalwa said the accused Sahil worked as a fridge and AC mechanic. He lived in a rented accommodation with his parents and three siblings in Shahbad Dairy area. "Police reached the crime spot after some locals informed them about the incident. Her body was found lying on the road in a pool of blood," a senior official said. A case under Section 302 (murder) of the Indian Penal Code has been registered at Shahbad Dairy police station on the basis of the complaint lodged by the victim's father, the police added. Police said the weapon used in commission of

crime is yet to be recovered. The victim's father is a labourer, and the girl had passed Class 10 this year. The victim's parents and her brother, who are residents of JJ Colony in Shahbad Dairy, said she was staying with her friend Neetu for the last 15 days since the latter's husband was out of Delhi for work. Recalling Sunday's event, Neetu, who has two children, said the victim was busy organising the birthday party for her daughter and went to the nearby market to get a dress for the child. She informed Neetu that she wanted to use the washroom and was going to their common friend's place. Neetu claimed that the girl and Sahil often fought with each other but she got to know about their "friendship" only six months ago. Seeking justice for their daughter, the victim's parents demanded capital punishment for the accused. They said neither she nor her friends had told them about Sahil. Soon after the incident, the accused along with his family fled after locking their house. Their landlord, Ramphool, said that the family had been staying at his place as tenants for the past two years and Sahil usually kept to himself. "He was an ordinary youth who lived with his parents and three sisters. He kept to himself and never argued or indulged in any kind of fight.

CBI books Rolls Royce for graft in Jet Trainer deal

The Statement of Fact was cited in a judgment by Crown Court Southwark, UK which showed that a sum of GBP 1.85 million was paid to an intermediary to retrieve the list of middlemen seized by the Income Tax Department during a survey of Rolls Royce India during 2006 to prevent the list from falling into the hands of Defence Ministry which could have resulted in the termination of the contract and a CBI probe. Later, Tim Jones joined income tax department proceedings and his statement was recorded. "It is alleged that Rolls Royce plc was involved in bribing tax officials and other officials of the Government of India to prevent investigation by Indian authorities into the tax affairs and use of advisors by Rolls Royce and payment of commission/fees to intermediaries and middlemen," the CBI FIR alleged. The CBI FIR alleged that an amount of GB Pounds 1.85 million was paid by Rolls Royce to intermediaries by means of commercial contractual agreements by retrieval of List of commission agents/advisors from Income Tax Department. "The (Preliminary) Enquiry further reveals that in 2008-10, in furtherance of the criminal conspiracy, the accused persons also approved

Licence manufacturing of 57 additional aircraft by HAL (Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd.) for a value of Rs 9,502.68 crore under a separate agreement with BAE Systems (operations) Ltd., another entity belonging to the BAES Group, the PE report which is part of the FIR alleged. Over 2,000 participants, including governments and observers, from nearly 200 countries have descended on the meeting hosted at the Paris-based UN cultural agency, UNESCO. According to a report "Turning off the Tap: How the world can end plastic pollution and create a circular economy", by the UN Environment Programme (UNEP), plastic pollution could be reduced by 80 per cent by 2040 if countries and companies make deep policy and market shifts using existing technologies. Plastic pollution would take up 10-13 per cent of the global carbon budget, endangering the climate. "The way we produce, use and dispose of plastics is polluting ecosystems, creating risks for human health and destabilising the climate," said Inger Andersen, UNEP Executive Director. "This UNEP report lays out a roadmap to dramatically reduce these risks through adopting a circular approach that keeps plastics out of ecosystems, out of our bodies and in the economy. If we follow this roadmap, including in negotiations on the plastic pollution deal, we can deliver major economic, social and environmental wins." However, keeping in view that not much time is left for negotiations, experts at the Paris meet say in this second session it's critical that decisions are made about objectives and scope of the text - such as what kind of plastics it will focus on. But that is easier said than done. According to the UNEP, under a business-as-usual scenario and in the absence of necessary interventions, the amount of plastic waste entering aquatic ecosystems could nearly triple from some 9-14 million tonnes per year in 2016 to a projected 23-37 million tons per year by 2040. To slash plastic pollution by 80 per cent globally by 2040, the UNEP latest report suggests first eliminating problematic and unnecessary plastics to reduce the size of the problem. Subsequently, the report calls for three market shifts — reuse, recycle and reorient and diversify products. The "High ambition coalition" of countries, led by Norway and Rwanda wants limits on plastic production and restrictions on some of the chemicals used in plastics as it is necessary to protect human health and the environment while helping to restore biodiversity and curb climate change. The coalition is committed to an international, legally binding instrument to end plastic pollution by 2040. Alternatively, the treaty could have a more limited scope to address plastic waste and scale up recycling, as some of the plastic-producing and oil and gas exporters want. Most plastic is made from fossil fuels. Countries supporting this plan include the United States, Saudi Arabia and China. The US delegation in Uruguay said national plans would allow governments to prioritize the most important sources and types of plastic pollution.

Wrestlers won't be allowed to protest at Jantar Mantar: Cops

Soon after, the Delhi Police cleared the site of their over-month-long sit-in at Jantar Mantar and said they would not be allowed to return there. The police said 700 people were detained across the national Capital. As many as 109 protesters, including the three wrestlers, were detained at Jantar Mantar. Women detainees were released later in the evening on Sunday. Meanwhile, the Delhi Police's first information report against grapplers, has said that protesting wrestlers ignored police warning that creating a ruckus during the opening of the new Parliament building would "harm national prestige" and will not be tolerated but they tried to march towards it. The FIR states at least 15 security personnel, a majority of them policewomen, were injured during the scuffle on Sunday between them and the wrestlers who also ignored police request to continue their protest at Jantar Mantar. Police said the FIR was registered against Vinesh Phogat, Sangeeta Phogat, Bajrang Punia and others on the complaint of Head Constable Madhav, who was posted at the Barakhamba police station in New Delhi district. Madhav was injured dur-

ing the scuffle with the protesting wrestlers when they were detained, the FIR said. The protesters were told to continue the protest at the notified site — Jantar Mantar," it said. However, as announced by them, at 11.30 am, Bajrang Punia, Vinesh Phogat, Sakshi Malik and others raised slogans and reached the first police barricade, according to the FIR. "Despite repeatedly telling protesters, they didn't adhere to the requests. They went ahead, jumped the first barricades and pushed police and reached the second barricade line where again the police personnel tried to stop them but they continued pushing police and also they pushed away barricades." Names of 15 police personnel, including women constables who sustained injuries in the scuffle at Jantar Mantar on Sunday, were also mentioned in the FIR. The FIR was registered under relevant sections including 188 (disobedience to order duly promulgated by public servant), 186 (obstructing public servant in discharge of public functions), 353 (assault or criminal force to deter public servant from discharge of his duty), 332 (voluntarily causing hurt to deter public servant from his duty) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC).

In a statement, Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva said the case should be tried in a fast track court. "The brutal murder of a Hindu girl by youth Sahil Sarfaraz in Shahbad has once again shown that Love Jihad has now rocked Delhi as well," Sachdeva said. "Love jihad" is a term often used by Right-wing activists to allege a plot by Muslim men to lure Hindu women into religious conversion through marriage. The Aftab Poonawalla-Shraddha Walkar case a few months ago jolted Delhi, and now this has once again warned Delhiites to beware of 'Love Jihad', said Sachdeva. He alleged Kejriwal was afraid of losing the votes of the minority community and was, therefore, "portraying" it as an "ordinary" murder instead of "love jihad." BJP leader Kapil Mishra, too, compared the murder with the Walkar case, wherein the woman was killed by her live-in partner who chopped her body into several parts. "This painful murder has happened in Delhi. Shraddha (Walkar) hasn't got justice yet. Don't know how many more Shraddhas will become victims of this brutality," he said. Delhi Commission for Women Chairperson Swati Malwani slammed the Delhi Police and alleged that "no one is afraid" of the police or the law in the national Capital. "I have never seen such a frightening case.

Teen girl's parents seek capital punishment for killer

The parents of the teenage girl who was stabbed and bludgeoned to death by a youth in northwest Delhi claimed they were not aware if she had any acquaintance with the accused and demanded capital punishment for him.

Police said the victim, and the accused, 20-year-old Sahil, were in a "relationship" but had a quarrel on Saturday.

Waiting at the Ambedkar Hospital to receive their daughter's body, the victim's parents said they were not aware if she had any acquaintance with Sahil. "We need justice for our daughter. She was brutally stabbed multiple times and her head was

smashed repeatedly with a stone. We want the accused to be hanged to death," her father Janak Raj said.

Her mother said her daughter had been staying at her friend Neetu's house in Shahbad Dairy for the past 15 days as the latter's husband was out of the station for work.

"My daughter had been staying with Neetu and her two children for the past 15 days. Just yesterday (Sunday) around 1:30 pm, I spoke to my daughter. She told me that she would return home once Neetu's husband was back and I was eagerly waiting for her. Little did I know that she would never return," she said. With teary eyes, she demanded justice for her daughter and said, "The accused should be

hanged to death."

The victim's father, a labourer, said the police have assured them justice for their daughter and they believe in the system.

Recalling Sunday's incident, he said her daughter was excited about organising the birthday party of her friend's daughter and had gone out shopping.

"At the market, Sahil approached her and asked her to come with him. But when my daughter asked him why, he stabbed her multiple times and soon fell unconscious. He then smashed her head repeatedly with stones," he said. The victim's parents said their daughter, who passed the class 10 exam this year never told them about Sahil.

"It was when the police informed us that we got to know about Sahil. Our daughter never told about being harassed by anyone," the victim's father added. The family was in intense grief and pain as the 16-year-old's mortal remains were cremated Monday evening.

The mother of the deceased, watching helplessly as the pyre was lit, said, "We had our dinner

and were planning to sleep when her daughter's friend Bhawana knocked our door on Sunday around 9 pm. She informed us that someone has killed her daughter. We did not believe her words and I called Neetu, who told me that she had gone to market. We rushed to the spot and saw our daughter lying there in a pool of blood."

"We met a person in the hospital who said he was there at the spot and tried to save their daughter, but he was also attacked by the accused," she said.

An elderly woman, who witnessed the Sunday's incident, said, "People gather near our house every evening and have liquor or drugs. When we try to disperse them, they abuse us and threaten us."

Sahil never indulged in brawl with anyone in locality, claims landlord

Sahil, the 20-year-old youth who brutally killed his "girlfriend", was an "ordinary man" who kept to himself and never indulged in any argument or fight with anyone in his locality, said his landlord.

The Delhi Police arrested Sahil from Bulandshahr on Monday, a day after he killed a 16-year-old girl by stabbing her more than 20 times and bludgeoning her head with a

cement slab in a busy Shahbad Dairy bylane as passersby looked on petrified.

Sahil had been staying with his parents and three sisters at a rented house in a colony in the area for the last two years.

"In these two years, I have never seen him nor his family fighting or indulging in any kind of argument or fight with anyone. I never got any complaint against him from any of our neighbours," Ramphool, Sahil's landlord, said.

Rain, wind, overcast skies turn Delhi weather pleasant

No heatwave till June 4, predicts IMD

A fresh spell of rains, gusty winds and overcast skies turned weather pleasant in the national Capital on Monday, with the India Meteorological Department's Regional Forecasting Centre saying heatwave conditions are unlikely to return to the Capital till June 4.

Winds gusting up to 50 kmph swept the Capital on Monday afternoon and several areas reported light rains.

The IMD data showed that Delhi has recorded a 209 per cent excess in rainfall in May after a set of thunderstorms that hit the city. The Met office has issued a 'yellow' alert, cautioning people of traffic disruptions and inundation of low-lying areas.

The Safdarjung Observatory, Delhi's primary weather station, recorded a minimum temperature of 21.8 degrees Celsius, five notches below normal, on Monday. The maximum temperature is



likely to settle around 35 degrees Celsius.

May, historically the hottest month in Delhi with a mean maximum temperature of 39.5 degrees Celsius, has recorded below-normal temperatures and excess rain this time.

Meteorologists attributed the phenomenon to higher-than-usual western disturbances — weather systems that originate in the Mediterranean region

and bring unseasonal rainfall to northwest India — this season.

According to IMD data, the Safdarjung Observatory has so far recorded 86.7 mm of rainfall in May. On average, the national capital logs 19.7 mm of rainfall in the whole month.

Delhi also witnessed an unusual episode of dense fog earlier this month. The minimum temperature dropped to 15.8 degrees Celsius on May 4,

making it the third coolest May morning since the IMD started keeping records in 1901.

The city logged more than 20 mm of rainfall in April, the highest in the month since 2017. The Safdarjung Observatory has not recorded any heatwave day this season so far. The threshold for a heat wave is met when the maximum temperature of a station reaches at least 40 degrees Celsius in the plains, 37 degrees in the coastal areas, and 30 degrees in the hilly regions, and the departure from normal is at least 4.5 degrees.

According to the IMD, a fresh western disturbance will bring gusty winds, rain and even hail to some places on Tuesday. The maximum temperature is predicted to remain below the 40-degree mark until June 4.

Earlier this month, the weather office predicted below-normal maximum temperatures and fewer heatwave days in northwest India in May.

Man gets 20-year jail term without remission for raping, killing woman

The Delhi High Court has modified the sentence of life imprisonment awarded to a man for raping a woman, inserting sticks in her private parts, before strangling her, to 20 years in jail without remission.

The High Court considered the "diabolic and depraved manner" in which the man took the victim to a solitary place and not only sexually assaulted her but inserted broken sticks in her vaginal and anal cavities before killing her by strangulation, and said he deserved imprisonment for a fixed term without remission.

The court also noted the mitigating circumstances including that the man is 38 years old at the moment, has undergone 8 years of imprisonment and has to look after two minor children and a wife as there is nobody else in the family to take care of them.

"Considering the mitigat-



ing and extenuating circumstances, this court finds that a sentence of imprisonment for a period of 20 years without remission would serve the purpose. Consequently, the sentence awarded to the appellant by the trial court is modified to rigorous imprisonment for a period of 20 years without remission," a bench of Justices Mukta Gupta and Poonam A Bamba said.

The High Court also asked the man to deposit a ₹60,000 fine and, if realised, the amount shall be paid as compensation

to the legal heirs of the deceased woman. The High Court's verdict came on a plea by convict Ram Tej challenging his conviction and life imprisonment awarded by a trial court in May 2018 after holding him guilty for the rape and murder of the woman, who was in early thirties.

Earlier, the High Court had refused to set aside the man's conviction for raping the woman and inserting sticks in her private parts before strangling her. The High Court upheld the man's conviction,

saying the forensic evidence, including DNA analysis, clinch the case of the prosecution that the man did commit rape.

"Thus these two clothes ... as per DNA analysis, clinch the case of the prosecution that appellant committed the rape of the deceased, brutally inserted sticks in her vagina and anal cavities, tied her and strangled her to death," it had said, adding it has found no error in the conviction judgment.

According to the prosecution, the woman's husband had in January 2015 reported her missing when she did not return home from work. The next morning, police found the half-naked body of the woman with her neck and legs tied with a cloth in a nursery in Fatehpur Beri area in South Delhi.

During the investigation, it was revealed that there were frequent calls between the victim and the accused. The man was tracked down and arrested on the basis of the call details.

DU rejigs UG admission norms for ECA, sports seats

Delhi University has rejigged the norms for undergraduate admission under the extracurricular activities (ECA) and sports quota as the two categories will be given 2.5 per cent supernumerary seats each.

Supernumerary seats are those that are over and above the intake approved by an authority.

According to DU official, the number of seats under the two categories will now be calculated programme-wise, not college-wise as it was done earlier. A motion in this regard was passed in the DU's Academic Council meeting last week. The final call will be taken by the Executive Council, the highest decision-making body of the university.

Until now, it was the discretion of the colleges to decide the number of ECA or sports category admissions with a ceiling cap of 5 per cent of total intake capacity. Representation of at least 1 per cent under each category was also mandatory. DU Dean of Admission Haneeet Gandhi said he believed the new norms will bring "parity".

"The ceiling is 5 per cent of the total intake capacity of the college in total for ECA and sports together. An equal weightage of 2.5 per cent each will be given to sports and ECA. Until now, it was upon colleges to decide how much weightage they wish to give ECA or sports varying from 1 to 4 per cent," DU Dean of Admission Haneeet Gandhi said.

Candidates must appear in CUET (UG) - 2023 to avail the supernumerary quota under the two categories.

Excise scam: Sisodia generated ₹622 cr POC, claim ED sources

The Enforcement Directorate's (ED) ongoing probe into the Delhi's Excise Policy scam has revealed that former Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia had allegedly generated ₹622.67 crore Proceeds of Crime (POC) through different modus operandi, sources said. The ED sources said the POC was generated through credit notes, hawala channel and direct kickbacks. This latest allegation has been mentioned in the charge sheet.

The ED further alleged that Sisodia facilitated the formation a special purpose vehicle to create a recoupment apparatus. "₹100 crore kickbacks were paid by the South Group to Vijay Nair. Indospirits acquired an L1 License with the help of Sisodia and Nair, it made a profit of ₹192.8 crore which is POC. The outstanding payments of three entities controlled by Sarath Reddy, Trident Chemphar, Avantika

Contractors and Organomix Ecosystems towards Indospirits is ₹60 crore. This outstanding payment is POC. Excess Credit Notes of ₹4.35 crore were issued by Indospirits, profits of ₹163.5 crore were accrued by Pernod Ricard, this firm formed a super cartel with the

South Group and further accrued a profit of ₹45.77 crore, these are all deemed as POC," the sources said.

They said the ED further learned that the South Group infused excess cash ₹41.13 crore into the account of entities belonging to Sarath Reddy. The ED has alleged that apart from this through misuse

of Punjab government's machinery and arm-twisting Mahadev Liquors, two firms -- Shiv Associates and Diwan Spirits -- accrued a profit of ₹8.02 crore, accused Amit Arora paid a bribe of ₹2 crore to Sisodia through Dinesh Arora and bribe of ₹4.9 crore given by Aman Dhall through an excess credit note, which it nothing but POC.

Fire exchanged between Bajrang Dal workers, cattle smugglers; FIR registered

Bajrang Dal workers and cattle smugglers exchanged fire after a late-night car chase on the Kundli-Manesar-Palwal (KMP) expressway, according to an FIR lodged by police.

Police said three cows and a calf were rescued from the black Scorpio, on which alleged cow smugglers had pasted Haryana Police stickers. The incident happened around 3 am on Monday in the Farukhnagar area, they said, adding that the vehicle has been seized.

According to the FIR registered on the basis of a complaint filed by Bajrang Dal member Tinku, he along with other workers reached the Farukhnagar toll after receiving the information that the smugglers will load the animals in their car and go towards

Rajasthan through the expressway. After noticing the vehicle, they attempted to stop it but the driver sped away. The rear tyres of the car burst during the 8-km chase and the smugglers started firing at the cow vigilantes, Tinku alleged.

"We tried to nab the smugglers but all five got down from their car and one of them started firing. When we started firing in defence, they fled into the fields, taking advantage of the darkness, and the police were also reached on the spot," he said in his complaint. The cows have been taken to the gushala, police said.

An FIR has been registered against the unidentified accused under sections 307 (attempt to murder) of the IPC, section 11-D of the Animal Cruelty Act and the Arms Act at Farukhnagar police station on Monday.

Two die after truck hits bike at Kalindi Kunj

Two persons have died after the motorcycle they were riding was hit by a truck in the national Capital's Kalindi Kunj area, an official said on Monday.

The accident took place on Sunday. The deceased were identified as Vishal Sharma (23) and Nayan (24) — both residents of Faridabad in Haryana.

A senior police officer said that on Sunday, a call regarding a fatal accident was received at Kalindi Kunj police station following which a police team was dispatched to the spot.

"On Agra Canal Road, near Kalindi Kunj Metro Station, the police team found one bike and a truck in an accidental condition," the police officer said, adding: "Two men riding the bike were found dead on the spot with the head of one of them crushed."

Undertrial prisoner attacked with knife, hand-made sua, tile in Tihar; hospitalised

An undertrial prisoner lodged in Tihar jail here was injured after he was allegedly attacked by other inmates with an improvised knife and handmade tool on Monday, officials said.

The incident took place at 12.38 pm inside Central Jail no 1 at the Tihar prison complex, they said. According to the officials, the inmates attacked Rahul Pawan with an improvised knife, handmade sua and a tile.

One of the attackers, undertrial prisoner Alok alias Vishal, also inflicted self-injuries, they said. Soon the jail staff, Tamil Nadu Special Police and a Quick Response Team



intervened and the inmates involved in the incident were separated immediately, he said.

"After giving primary medical aid at the jail dispensary, both the injured were moved to Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital for further medical treatment," the jail official said.

They have also intimated about the incident to Hari Nagar police station asking them to lodge an FIR and take further legal action in the matter.

Bouncers thrash man at club in front of wife over minor dispute

Ashram-DND flyover extn opens for heavy vehicles

The opening of the flyover extension to heavy traffic is expected to provide immense relief to lakhs of commuters who rely on this route daily. "With the removal of restrictions, the travel time for both commercial and private vehicles is expected to decrease significantly, leading to improved efficiency and reduced congestion, she added.

Earlier, heavy vehicles were restricted from using the flyover resulting in longer travel times and congestion on alternate routes.

The connection of the loop from Sarai Kale Khan to Lajpat Nagar is also expected to complete within five days, she said.

"This strategic infrastructure development will ensure better traffic management, resulting in a seamless and smooth travel experience for all Delhi commuters," Atishi added.

ICMR to form team to prevent suicides

Urges researchers to join 'suicide prevention intervention' study

Alarmed at the rising number of suicide cases in the country, particularly among school and college students, the Government's premier health research institute, Indian Council of Medical and Research (ICMR) has woken up to the need for a suicide prevention framework that is based on scientific interventions.

It has called upon the researchers from across the country to join the team being constituted for ICMR's Multistate Implementation Research Study on Suicide Prevention Interventions. In India, the suicide rate has been on the rise with a reported rate of 12 per 100,000 of the population in 2021, reflecting a 6.2 per cent increase from the previous year.

"The goal is to reduce the burden due to suicidal behaviour and promote mental well-being, thereby improving the mental health outcomes in the country," an official from the ICMR.

According to the World Health Organisation (WHO),



the crude suicide rate in the age-group 15-29 years (per 100,000 population for both sexes) for India has been recorded as 15.721, thus indicating that suicidal behaviour has become a significant public health concern, especially among the young age groups.

The Covid-19 pandemic induced factors such as stress, isolation, and economic difficulties have just worsened the mental health of this particular group, noted the official.

"Though there has been some progressive actions by the country in this regard such as launch of the National Suicide Prevention Strategy last year in November with an objective to reduce the suicide mortality by 10 per cent by 2030. Despite these alarming statistics, a suicide prevention framework that is based on scientific interventions is largely lacking in the country," said the official.

According to the health

experts, suicides are preventable, for every 40 seconds a person dies by suicide somewhere in the world and many more attempt suicide.

The inclusion of "Suicide Mortality Rate" as an indicator under the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) monitoring framework (Indicator 3.4.2), demonstrates the global commitment to address this issue more effectively. Suicides occur throughout the lifespan, notably, among young people 15-29 years of age, suicide is the second leading cause of death globally.

Suicide prevention interventions among school and college students will be implemented through training teachers, counsellors, staff members, parents, peers etc who will identify signs of distress and respond appropriately, the official said.

Under coping strategies, students will be taught mechanisms to manage stress and build resilience while under health promotion initiatives, stress would be on healthy lifestyle such as, adequate physical activity, healthy diet, away from addictions (tobacco, alcohol, other psychotropic substances, internet), and mental health promotion.

Students at high risk will also be identified while focus will also be on enhancing social skills, fostering positive relationships and reducing isolation, the official added.

Cong cheated K'taka voters: Bommai

Ex-CM accuses State Govt of delaying, putting conditions to poll promises, guarantees

Taking note of Congress party's alleged 'delay' in implementing the five guarantees committed by it during Karnataka poll campaign, former Chief Minister and BJP leader Basavaraj Bommai on Monday accused the Congress of "cheating voters" by "attaching conditions" to its guarantees and doubted whether it would "fully operationalize" them.

Bommai expressed doubts whether the Congress government would fulfill its promises maintaining that the ruling party may soon show their true colours by using delaying tactics towards announcing legislative provisions for implementing poll-guarantees.

After some tug of war for key cabinet posts, Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah has allocated portfolios to ministers, keeping the Finance department with himself while assigning the Irrigation and Bengaluru City Development departments to his deputy DK Shivakumar.

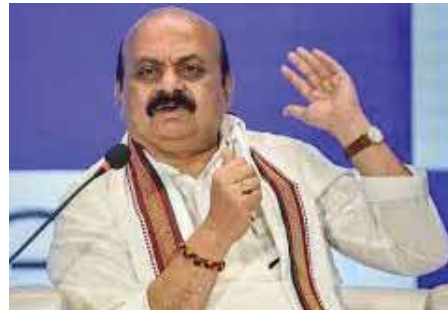
Siddaramaiah took the oath of office with Shivakumar and eight ministers on May 20.

Instances have come to notice where women who voted for the Congress have refused to pay for the bus tickets in Bengaluru drawing attention to the 'free-ride promise' by the party. Similarly, many have resolved not to pay for the bill below 200 units.

"Looking at various statements by Ministers, it looks like — it is certain that they said something and will do something else. During the election without speaking about any conditions they said it (guarantees) will be free for everyone. The Chief Minister had said with example that — it is free for me, you and everyone," Bommai said.

Speaking to newsmen at Bengaluru, he said in the in-principle approval order too it was mentioned that guarantees will be for everyone, but now statements are being made that they will be applicable only to those eligible and not for everyone.

"By making changes they (Congress) have made 'dhoka' (cheated) to the people of Karnataka. People have given them power



based on these guarantees, without responding to it, they are speaking about the previous (BJP) government's promises....Them (Congress leaders) making lame excuses, indicates that they will not operationalise the guarantees fully. Their true colours will come out in open in a few days," he added.

Responding to a question about delay in choosing the Leader of Opposition in the Assembly, Bommai said, there is no delay, normally the Leader of Opposition is elected on the eve of the first session, and it is going to happen accordingly.

The Congress had promised to implement the 'guarantees' — 200 units of free power to all households (Gruha Jyoti), ₹2,000 monthly assistance to the woman head of every family (Gruha Lakshmi), 10 kg of rice free to every member of a BPL household (Anna Bhagya), ₹3,000 every month for unemployed graduate youth and ₹1,500 for unemployed diploma holders (both in the age group of 18-25) (YuvaNidhi), and free travel for women in public transport buses (Shakti), on the very first day of assuming power in the state.

After having accorded in-principle approval for guarantees in the first cabinet meeting on May 20, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah had said they would "most likely" be implemented after the next Cabinet meeting.

In Himachal Pradesh where Congress won the assembly election this year, the party had made similar guarantees including the implementation of old-pension scheme, some of them have been implemented.

Govt committed to fulfilling poll guarantees, no need to worry: Shivakumar

Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar on Monday said there is a "responsible government" in the state, which will fulfill all the guarantees made to the people ahead of the assembly polls.

He, however, did not specify any timeline to implement the guarantees, but maintained that the cabinet meeting on June 1 will discuss on fulfilling them.

"There is a cabinet meeting on June 1, the Chief Minister has the responsibility of the Finance department, he will discuss with officials and bring the relevant information to the cabinet. We will keep up our promise. We will have to do it systematically and preparations are on," Shivakumar said.

Speaking to reporters here, he said, "there is a responsible government in the state and it will keep up the promises made to its people and there is no need to worry."

Noting that all the Ministers have been instructed to review their respective departments, the Deputy CM said, all the Ministers including him will begin their work



today. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, who expanded his cabinet on Saturday by inducting 24 new Ministers, has allocated portfolios to all the ministers in his Cabinet, late last night.

There is mounting pressure on the new Congress government by opposition parties and various sections of people from across the state, to fulfill its five poll guarantees.

In the maiden Cabinet meeting of this government, soon after the swearing-in of Chief Minister, Deputy Chief Minister and eight Ministers on May 20, it was decided to accord "in-principle" approval to the Congress' five 'guarantees' promised before the elections.

The 'guarantees' would "most likely" be implemented after the next Cabinet meeting, Siddaramaiah, who chaired the cabinet meeting, had told reporters that day.

Delhi HC issues notice to Yasin as NIA seeks death penalty for him

The Delhi High Court on Monday issued a notice to separatist leader Yasin Malik, who is presently serving a life term, on a plea by the National Investigation Agency seeking death penalty for him in a terror funding case. A bench of Justices Siddharth Mridul and Talwant Singh also issued warrants for production of Malik before it on August 9.

Solicitor General (SG) Tushar Mehta, who appeared on behalf of the National Investigation Agency (NIA), argued that the accused indulged in terrorist and secessionist activities and should be awarded death penalty by treating the matter as a "rarest of rare" case.

Mehta stated that Malik committed the "sensational" killing of four IAF officers and even kidnapped the daughter of



then Home Minister Mufti Mohammad Sayeed which led to the release of four dreaded criminals who masterminded the 26/11 attack in Mumbai in 2008.

"In view of the ground that Yasin Malik, sole respondent in this appeal, has inter alia pleaded guilty to a charge under IPC section 121 (waging war against the Government of India) which provides for an alternate death sentence, we issue notice to him... To be served through the jail superintendent," the court ordered.

Let warrants be issued for

his production on the next date of hearing, it added.

The court also issued notice to Malik on NIA's application seeking condonation of delay in "re-filing" the present appeal. Mehta urged the court to condone the delay, saying "technicalities" should not have a bearing in matters such as the present one.

On May 24, 2022, a trial court here had awarded life imprisonment to Jammu Kashmir Liberation Front chief Malik after holding him guilty for various offences under the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) and the IPC.

Malik had pleaded guilty to the charges, including those under the UAPA, and he was convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment.

Such a tactic by an accused to avoid death penalty, he said, cannot be allowed when he

knows that facing trial would lead to imposition of capital punishment.

"Any terrorist can come here, do terrorist activities, plead guilty and court says since he has pleaded guilty, I give him only life term and not capital punishment," said Mehta, adding that even Osama bin Laden would have been permitted to plead guilty here and that "possibly the USA was right" in its dealing with the Al Qaeda founder.

The court responded that there could be no comparison between Malik and Laden as the latter never faced trial and it would not comment on matters affecting foreign relations. During his submissions, Mehta said Malik crossed over to Pakistan for training, was coordinating stone pelting and spreading "rumours" on social media about oppression by security forces.

NIA files 2nd supplementary chargesheet in Naxal attack case in which 2 cops died

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Saturday filed its second supplementary chargesheet in the case related to the Naxal attack on former MLA Gurcharan Nayak, in which two police personnel were killed in Jharkhand in January 2022.

The NIA has named two accused in the chargesheet filed in the NIA Special Court Ranchi. The chargesheeted accused are 25-year-old Tivari Bankaria alias Shaka and 20-year-old Sadan Korah alias Sajan, both armed cadres of Communist Party of India (Maoist), a proscribed terrorist organization, the NIA said in a statement.

The duo hails from West Singhbhum district of Jharkhand and has been charged under various sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act.

While Tivari was arrested on November 30, 2022, Sadan has been in custody since February 13, 2023.

The attack took place on January 4 last year at High School Jhiltrua, Police Station Goikera, West Singhbhum. The Jharkhand police had initially registered the case (FIR No. 01/2022) at the local police station. Subsequently, on June



30, 2022, the NIA re-registered the case.

Following investigations, NIA had charge-sheeted 14 accused persons on December 31, 2022 in this case.

"As per NIA investigations, Tivari and Sadan were providing support to CPI (Maoist) for furthering its terror and violence related activities and waging a war against the Government of India. They were part of the conspiracy to carry out the terrorist attack on Gurcharan Nayak and his bodyguards. They were also part of the Special Action Team established by the banned terror outfit to execute the crime," the agency said in a statement.

The two accused had attended the meeting in which the conspiracy to attack Gurcharan Nayak with deadly weapons at Project +2, High School Jhiltrua, was hatched. They had reconnoitered the spot a day before the incident and had also participated in the training to execute the attack, it added.

KHALISTANI ATTACK ON INDIAN HIGH COMMISSION

Ensure security of our diplomatic missions, EAM urges UK Min

Jaishankar took to Twitter to share the issues he raised during his discussions with Lord Ahmad. "Met with UK MOS Lord Tariq Ahmad today in New Delhi... Underlined

the obligation to ensure security of our diplomatic missions and prevent misuse of democratic freedoms," the External Affairs Minister said.

In April, the Union Home Ministry had handed over the probe in the case of attack on the Indian mission in London to the National Investigation Agency (NIA) after a meeting with representatives from Britain.

Jaishankar said he also discussed a broad range of issues ranging from the Free Trade Agreement and South Asia to Indo-Pacific and G20 with the visiting minister.

HC refuses relief to teen who failed to fill form for JEE-Advanced

Admission process for IITs based on discipline: Court

Institutes such as the Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) are centres of technical studies par excellence in the country and the process of finding students is based on discipline, the Bombay High Court said while refusing relief to an 18-year-old boy who failed to submit his

online form for the Joint Entrance Exam (JEE) Advanced due to a technical glitch. The boy, Atharva Desai, in his petition claimed that he lived in a rural area where there were frequent power outages because of which he was unable to register himself online in the given time frame.

The petitioner sought a direction from the court for his registration form to be accepted and to permit him to appear for JEE-Advanced scheduled to be held on June 4.

The Joint Admission Board



of the IIT opposed the plea on the ground that as per their records, Desai had logged in on the portal for the first time to fill the online form a day after the deadline and hence, no relief ought to be granted to him. A vacation bench of Justices Abhay Ahuja and Milind Sathaye, in its May 24 order, accepted the IIT's argu-

ment and said it could not disturb the discipline adopted by the institution in the larger interest of lakhs of aspiring meritorious students of the country.

The order copy was made available on Monday. It is not in doubt that IITs, NITs and other institutes are centres of technical studies par excellence in India. The process of finding the best talent in this country is based on discipline which is of utmost importance in the field of education," the court said.

SC dismisses plea against eligibility criterion of 75% marks in Class XII board exams for admission to IITs

"This condition was always there, why should we interfere? This is not a matter we want to get into," the bench said.

₹2K note saga cast doubts on stability of Indian currency: PC

Termining the nine-year-long rule of the Narendra Modi Government as a "complete failure on all fronts", senior Congress leader and former Union Finance Minister P. Chidambaram on Monday ridiculed the introduction of Rs 2,000 note seven years ago and its subsequent withdrawal recently had "cast doubts on the integrity and stability of Indian currency."

Addressing a news conference as part of the part of the people across the country to expose the Modi government's failure on all front, Chidambaram said: "In the

first place, the people had no need for the Rs 2000 notes after the Rs 500-Rs 1000 value notes were demonetised (in November 2016).... The thoughtless — some would even say foolish — introduction of the Rs 2000 note (which the people shunned) and the mortifying spectacle of withdrawing the note have cast doubt on the integrity and stability of India's currency."

Chidambaram said that he didn't agree with the RBI's explanation that Rs 2000 note was introduced to meet the immediate requirement of people. "Within 30 days of its introduction, no one was using it. The notes didn't come to people. It was a foolish move bringing the integri-

ty of the currency system in question. The original decision to introduce it was foolish but the government didn't want to admit it," the former finance minister said.

Expressing his utter disappointment over the state of economy in the country, Chidambaram said: "Key economic indicators are pointing downward and there is low confidence that the economy will reach the high-growth path. The first three quarters of 2022-23 recorded growth rates of 13.2, 6.3 and 4.4 per cent, a declining trend. Lone WB Cong MLA joins TMC

Biswas said.

Coming against the backdrop of the multi-crore recruitment scam the Sagardighi elections had been interpreted as the beginning of the end of the Trinamool Congress rule and the rise of a new experiment in the form of Congress-Left camaraderie in Bengal.

Both the Congress and the Left drew a blank in the 2021 Assembly elections which was apparently conducted in an unprecedentedly polarized atmosphere.

The Congress immediately reacted to Biswas' joining the TMC saying the people of Sagardighi would remember the "deceit." Pradesh Congress president Adhir Chowdhury said, "they (TMC) may have purchased or coerced one

Congress slams BJP for removing Holkar, Savitribai statues from Maha Sadan

ISRO looking at testing Gaganyaan crew module mission by July

The Indian Space Research Organisation is gearing up for a host of activities at the spaceport here, including testing of the crew module in July for its ambitious Gaganyaan mission, Chairman S Somanath said here on Monday. The secretary of the department of space said the space agency was also working for the launch of the synthetic aperture radar mission in association with National Aeronautics Space Agency (NASA).

The NISAR (NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar Mission) is a joint earth-observing mission between NASA and ISRO with the goal of making global measurements of the causes and consequences of land surface changes using advanced radar imaging.

Talking about future launches, Somanath said the next launch would be a climate and weather observation satellite called "INSAT-3DS", which would be launched using a GSLV rocket.

"The same rocket (GSLV) is bound to take the NISAR as well. In the coming months we are going to have launches of PSLVs as well as GSLV MkIII," he said. "The SHAR (Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota) will be abuzz with activities towards all of this," he said.

Scientists are working on conducting various tests for the ambitious Gaganyaan mission and the agency is coordinating with the Navy and others in this connection, he said.

"We will be launching a test vehicle mission now. Target is to conduct it by July. The vehicle for conducting the test is already here in Satish Dhawan Space



Centre here," he said. This launch would demonstrate how the crew escapes in case of any accident during the Gaganyaan mission, he said.

"The vehicle will be taken to an altitude of 14 km and from there we would create a problem or try to destroy it and see how the crew module escapes. That we have to demonstrate. We are talking to various stakeholders like the Navy," he said. This mission has to be repeated again and after that there would be an unmanned mission probably next year in which the whole crew module would be taken to orbit and return, he said.

On setting up a launch pad in Kulasekarapattinam in Tamil Nadu about 600 km from Chennai, he said ISRO was almost in the final stages of acquiring 2,000 acres of land. "We will be building a launch pad for a small launch vehicle in Kulasekarapattinam and possible rocket launches for private players in future.

Land acquisition process is almost completed and some more land is yet to be acquired," he said. Somanath said the space agency was under discussion about the launch of the next-generation launch vehicle (NGLV).

"Now is not the right time to discuss it. It is a rocket which we want to be a recoverable stage, and basically (we are) working on liquid and semi-cryogenic technology," he said.

10 killed as car crushed in head-on collision with bus in Mysuru

Ten people, including two children, died on the spot and three persons were injured in a road accident in which a car was crushed in a head-on collision with a private bus in T Narasipura taluk here on Monday, police said.

The incident took place near Kuruburu village on Kollegala-T Narasipura main road.

According to the police, the car was completely crushed due to the impact of the accident in what seems to be a head-on collision between the

two vehicles. The injured have been rushed to hospital and are receiving treatment.

The deceased, said to be from Sanganakallu in Ballari district, were returning from B R Hills in an Innova car they had hired when the incident took place, a police officer said, adding that they had their train ticket reserved from Mysuru back to Ballari in the evening.

Two children are among the deceased, sources said. The private bus was said to be on its way towards Kollegala. The three injured, also passengers of the car, have been shifted to Chamarajanagara hospital.

CAG Murmu re-elected as WHO External Auditor

Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) Girish Chandra Murmu has been re-elected as External Auditor of the World Health Organization (WHO), Geneva, for a four-year term from 2024 to 2027.

The CAG has already been holding this position in the WHO since 2019 for a four-year term. The present election was held on Monday in the 76th World Health Assembly in Geneva, where the CAG of India was re-elected with an overwhelming majority (114 out of 156 votes) in the first round of voting itself, according to a press release issued by the office of the CAG.

The CAG was personally present at the meeting. After the election, in his address to the World Health Assembly, Murmu outlined his vision as External Auditor for the WHO, emphasising on process improvement for better outcomes, transparency and professional approach.

The CAG's appointment is recognition of the Indian institution's standing among



the international community as well as its professionalism, high standards, global audit experience and strong national credentials, the release said. This resounding victory was made possible by the sustained support and tireless efforts of the Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations at Geneva, his officers and a special team of handpicked officers from CAG.

This is the second major international audit assignment

for the CAG this year following his selection for the post of External Auditor (2024-2027) of International Labour Organization (ILO) in Geneva earlier this year in March 2023.

Besides WHO, the CAG of India is currently the External Auditor of the Food and Agriculture Organization (2020-2025), the International Atomic Energy Agency (2022-2027), the Organization for Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (2021-2023) and the

Inter Parliamentary Union (2020-2022).

The CAG is a Member of the United Nations (UN) Panel of External Auditors. He is also a member of the Governing Boards of the International Organization of Supreme Audit Institutions (INTOSAI) and ASOSAI. CAG chairs the INTOSAI Knowledge Sharing Committee, its Working Group on IT Audit, and the Compliance Audit Sub-Committee.

Active women have 25% less rate of Parkinson's disease: Study

Women who engaged themselves in regular exercise such as cycling, walking, gardening, cleaning and participating in sports had a 25 per cent lower rate of Parkinson's disease when compared to those who exercised the least, according to a study published in the journal Neurology.

Researchers also found that 10 years before diagnosis, physical activity declined at a faster rate in those with Parkinson's disease than in those without,



likely due to early symptoms of Parkinson's disease.

It found that female participants who exercised the most had a 25 per cent lower rate of Parkinson's disease when

compared to those who exercised the least.

The finding only shows an association and does not prove that exercise lowers the risk of developing Parkinson's disease,

a brain disorder that causes unintended or uncontrollable movements, such as shaking, stiffness, and difficulty with balance and coordination.

The study included 95,354 female participants, mostly teachers, with an average age of 49 who did not have Parkinson's disease at the start.

Researchers from the University of Pittsburgh, US and Radboud University Medical Center in The Netherlands followed participants for three decades during which 1,074 participants developed Parkinson's disease.

Over the course of the

study, participants completed up to six questionnaires about the types and amounts of physical activity they were getting.

They were asked how far they walked and how many flights of stairs they climbed daily, how many hours they spent on household activities as well as how much time they spent doing moderate recreational activities such as gardening and more vigorous activities such as sports.

Researchers assigned each activity a score based on the metabolic equivalent of a task (METs), a way to quantify energy expenditure.

A more intense form of exercise like cycling was six METs, while less intense forms of exercise such as walking and cleaning were three METs.

The average physical activity level for participants was 45 METs-hours per week at the start of the study.

Participants were divided into four equal groups of just over 24,000 people each.

At the start of the study, those in the highest group had an average physical activity score of 71 METs-hours per week. Those in the lowest group had an average score of 27 METs-hours per week.

It must have upset many Government and Bharatiya Janata Party supporters that the pomp and pageantry of the inauguration of the new Parliament building was accompanied with the news that the wrestlers at Jantar Mantar in Delhi were manhandled by Delhi Police. They have been protesting against Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh who also happens to be a BJP leader and parliamentarian. The Delhi Police has justified their action. "The dharna and demonstration of the wrestling wrestlers were going on smoothly at the notified place of Jantar Mantar. Yesterday, the protesters flouted the law in a frenzy despite all requests and requests. Hence, the ongoing dharna has been called off," a Deputy Commissioner of Police tweeted in Hindi. That may be true, but the unsavory incident did take some of the shine off the grand event which was presided over by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. At the heart of the issue is the ruling dispensation's reluctance to act against Singh.



It is a well-known fact that he is a political force to reckon with in not only the constituency in Uttar Pradesh he presents in the Lok Sabha but also adjoining districts. So, there are political compulsions in keeping him in good humour. But should these compulsions override every other consideration? What about the aspirations of sportspersons, their expectation to have a dignified life without the rapacity of unscrupulous sports officials? Most officials honestly ensure that their youngsters under their charge perform well, but there should be prompt action against those who are accused of wrongdoing. That didn't happen. Wrestlers, including medal winners, had to protest in the heart of the national capital to get a police report filed against Singh.

Besides, as we mentioned earlier, Singh is not exactly the kind of leader Modi's New India would project as an ideal leader. His image is that of a bahubali; years ago, he was charged with the Terrorist and Disruptive Activities (Prevention) Act or TADA for allegedly sheltering Dawood Ibrahim's aide Subhash Thakur. He has faced several other cases too, though he has never been convicted even in one of them. That, however, is not surprising, because many bahubalis don't get convicted for long periods. The protection that Singh enjoys is inconsistent with UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's claim of being tough on crime. More importantly, it is also at odds with the inspiring words spoken by the Prime Minister at the inauguration of the new Parliament. He said, "Today, a New India is setting new goals and forging new paths. There is a new enthusiasm and a new zeal. There is a new journey and a new perspective. The direction is new and the vision is new. The resolve is new, the confidence is new." Where does Singh fit into the new scheme of things?

Taking stock of 9 years of Modi Govt

The Modi Government has done well on infrastructure and kept the growth rate good though its record on the job front is not very impressive

On May 30, 2019, Prime Minister Narendra Modi took the oath of office for the second time in the forecourt of the Rashtrapati Bhavan as the blazing sun sweated out the audience, who then were more interested in finding the missing names in the new Council of Ministers. Modi had guided the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party to a spectacular victory in the Lok Sabha election, winning 303 seats in the Lower House of Parliament.

There was no precedent in the last decades of any party winning two massive mandates in back-to-back general elections. People had given resounding mandates to the Modi-led BJP, and they truly expected a fundamental change in the way the country was governed. Aspirational democracy was the buzzword within the BJP circles, and leaders in the saffron camp claimed that the people voted for Modi in the hope that their fate will change for the better.

Half of the second tenure of the Modi Government was accounted for by the hardships of the Covid-19 pandemic. Still, Modi had six and a half years of normal tenure. His government was also comfortably placed in Parliament. The BJP commanded an overwhelming majority to the extent that the Opposition ranks were most of the time beset by self-doubt.

In the Rajya Sabha also, the BJP was aided by the fence sitters to get some of the most contentious legislation, such as the abrogation of Article 370 redundant and criminalising the practice of triple talaq among Muslims, passed. Even the contentious farm laws were cleared, though these have to be withdrawn later.

So, the Modi Government came out with flying colours as far as the legislative business is concerned, particularly the core agenda of the ruling party and the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh, which were being mentioned in manifestos since the BJP was founded. The Modi Government also ticks the box on reducing the size of the statute book, eliminating redundant laws and lessening



the compliance burden for businesses. This explains India improving ranking in the global index on ease of doing business, as the country removed over 30,000 compliances after 2014.

Modi has been persistent in taking review meetings of the ambitious multi-purpose and multi-modal platform Pro-Active Governance And Timely Implementation (PRA-GATI) to take stock of the progress of infrastructure projects. Under his watch, several key projects saw the light of day, even in Jammu and Kashmir and the northeast. In this, he was aided by Road Minister Nitin Gadkari. If there is anyone in the Council of Ministers who has a say, it's Gadkari.

The Ganga Vilas, the longest river cruise, was a mega success, as the ship was fully booked by tourists from Switzerland, which also announced the arrival of the waterways in India.

Late Arun Jaitley and Nirmala Sitharaman, and Piyush Goyal briefly, have served the country as Finance Ministers during the last nine years. They have tried to execute Modi's vision and plans to the best of their capabilities. Modi's economic philosophy is influenced by the nudge theory—that is, incentivizing

The selection of priority areas for deliberations such as 'Foundational Literacy and Numeracy', 'Tech-enabled learning', 'Future of work' and 'Research and innovation collaboration', - broad-based discussions with enriching inputs from sectoral experts. There is little doubt that during the past few years, G20 countries have made significant progress in expanding the use of digital technologies for improving access to quality education, however, the sharing of more tangible and effective educational practices and experiences did help recognize where participating countries are and what they need to improve upon. Here, we can



collaborate to leverage technology further to achieve some common educational goals, as we still confront a lot of challenges in the process, especially when it comes to ensuring quality learning opportunities for all along with improving learning outcomes.

What the world including some of the G20 countries, need is accessible, inclusive and equitable school education, higher education and skill development. It is digital technologies that can bring parity in the quality and accessibility of education at all levels. For example, India has around 1.48 million schools, 265 million school students and nearly 9.5 million teachers, with more than 20 regional languages as medium of instruction alongside 62 educational boards of instruction across the country. Moreover, lakhs of students received their higher education in different languages. In such a case, only digital technology can be expected to provide equitable and inclusive education, as a lot of content and expert teachers are still not available in regional languages.

Hence, the union budget 2023 emphasises much on digitisation of education. The Digital India programme has received Rs 4,795.24 crore, and to boost digital infrastructure, the government has proposed initiatives like Digital Libraries and Digital Universities. States have also been urged to set up physical libraries at panchayat levels to provide infrastructure for accessing the National Digital Library resources. Digital initiatives with a focus on artificial intelligence terming it a step towards the 'digital revolution', have been hailed by all. Three centres of excellence for AI and 100 laboratories in engineering institutions for developing applications using 5G services, will only add to this process of digital revolution. Digital Universities aim to reach out to the remotest regions of the country with quality, skill-based and job-oriented courses and training. With the focus of the budget being on expanding reach, improving quality education, building capacity and strengthening the digital education ecosystem, we can now expect to have a world-class school and higher education system, which would be accessible to all.

gree, these 48 crore people were not deserving of being part of the economy.

When they joined the Indian financial system on the call of PM Modi for their inclusion, they brought a whopping Rs1.90 lakh crores in deposits to the banking system. The Modi model of the economy must be studied by all, as the gains of financial inclusions were not limited to the beneficiaries of the Jan Dhan Scheme but even the banks, which have been reporting record profits while also meeting all norms of healthy banking norms.

PM Modi brought empathy for the poor, women and the people at large in his caring statecraft. He brought the policy attention to areas that were never paid attention to. His first term addressed the dignity of women in the country, who had for ages been going in the darkness for toilet needs. According to the topmost priority to making India a defecation-free country, more than 11 crore toilets have been built in the country.

By sanctioning over four crores of houses under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, the Modi government has brought unprecedented changes for the better in the life of the people. Shelter and sanitation have been the hallmark of the Modi model of statecraft with empathy for the vulnerable sections of society. It should be examined why the Congress-led governments never thought of addressing the basic issues that concerned the well-being of the rural and the poor people.

By ensuring sanitary napkins for Rs 1, the Modi statecraft showed that the well-being of the people is at the core of the governance. This was again seen when once in a century pandemic struck the country. PM Modi first ensured that none in

the country slept hungrily. His intervention to protect the people from hunger saw the launch of the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana for 80 crore people free of cost, and 1121 lakh metric tonnes of foodgrains were made available to the population so that they could meet the hardships caused by Covid-19 outbreak. Access to potable water is needed to safeguard the health of the people and save them from water-borne diseases. It will be a task for the economists to measure the savings for the people on their out-of-pocket expenses due to the expanding coverage of tap water in homes.

Har Ghar Jal (Jal Jeevan Mission) is another example of the Modi government thinking of the well-being of the people, as more than eight crore rural households with more than 40 crore people have benefited under the programme.

Har Ghar Bijli (Saubhagya Yojana) also saw close to three crore households getting electrified under the scheme, covering over 99.9 per cent of the total households in the country. By March 2023, over nine crores of LPG connections were sanctioned under Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana, fulfilling the promise of a 'HarGhar Gas Cylinder'. This again bears the Modi model of economy's concerns that the policies should think of the wellbeing of the people, as it served to protect the women from kitchen smoke. Once more the women in the country because of the policy intervention of the Modi government were protected from ailments due to exposure to kitchen smoke.

Under Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY), close to 41 crore loans have been sanctioned since the launch of the scheme. Also, there has been a growth of more than 200 per cent in digital payment

volume during the last four years since 2018-19. UPI transactions alone have grown eight times in the last three years, which is 50 times in the last four years.

With over 41 crore people in India exiting poverty between 2005-06 and 2019-20 due to the committed efforts of the Modi government, we are today on track to eliminate extreme poverty by 2024.

If the social sector gains from the caring touch of the Modi model of governance, the economy has to lie on firm legs to run the ground full steam to attain the \$5 trillion tag in the next few years and also claim the status of the fourth largest economy. The economy is making good use of the extraordinary expansion of infrastructure, spanning roads, ports, waterways and airports, which hastened the making of a well-knit Indian economy with faster movements of goods.

On the security front, the Modi government has an unparalleled track record of almost terrorism-free track record. Also, India has made its border infrastructure robust with accelerated developments in states with long border regions. North-eastern states are well-connected with all parts of India. Now, there is no reason in the country, which is without being connected with major cities in the country. This has been shown to the delegates who are taking part in several meetings of the G20 all across the country.

By committing Rs 2.50 lakh crore for the railway infrastructure, the Modi government has brought much-needed energy and capacity to the national transporter, which carries the size of the population of Australia daily. It must be underlined that the Modi Era has laid the grounds for the 'Amrit Kaal' for India.

NITI Aayog must be revived for better Centre-State relations

PM Modi is facing united opposition from the non-BJP-ruled states. They have been ganging up against him despite their political differences

One of the first things Prime Minister Narendra Modi did soon after assuming office nine years ago was dismantling the Planning Commission with a legacy of 65 years and setting up the Niti Aayog in January 2015. Even as the chief minister of Gujarat earlier, Modi had some ideas for a stronger Centre-State relationship and reforms. He hoped that Niti Aayog would strengthen this relationship.

However, Modi still faces opposition from the non-BJP-ruled states. They have been ganging up against him due to their political differences. The new chief minister's club is growing by the day as they work in tandem.

Unsurprisingly, acting as a pressure group, some non-

BJP chief ministers had boycotted Saturday's Niti Aayog meeting addressed by

Modi. The conference's theme was "Viksit Bharat @2047: Role of Team India." These chief ministers could have participated and discussed 100 issues identified for the session. Instead, they stayed away.

Nineteen Opposition parties also boycotted the inauguration of the new Parliament building on May 28. They held that President Draupadi Murmu and not Modi should have that honour. Those who boycotted included Mamata Banerjee (West Bengal), Arvind Kejriwal (Delhi), Ashok Gehlot (Rajasthan), K. Chandrababu Naidu (Tamil Nadu), Nitish Kumar (Bihar), M.K.

Stalin (Tamil Nadu), Pinaray Vijayan (Kerala), and Naveen Patnaik (Odisha). The last name was a surprise addition as Patnaik had been keeping equidistance from both Congress and BJP. He is said to have been upset that President Draupadi Murmu, hailing from Odisha, had not been invited to the inauguration of the new Parliament. K.C. Rao skipped the Niti Aayog meeting even last year. Having a running battle with the Centre, he claimed, "Chief Ministers do not get enough time to speak, and after a few minutes, a bell rings saying you should stop now."

Mamata Banerjee wanted a revival of the Planning Commission instead of Niti Aayog, which she called a "paper tiger". Other chief ministers

gave some excuses for their absence, like prior engagements. It was clear that they worked in tandem.

It is not the first time such boycotts have taken place. Even during the Indira Gandhi era, late Andhra Pradesh chief minister N.T. Rama Rao walked out of the National Development Council protesting against the Centre. Doyens like the late Jyoti Basu, Ramakrishna Hegde and others, too, had walked out of the NDC meetings. As for Saturday's Aayog meeting, should the chief ministers have shown their anger by boycotting it, or should they have participated and explained their misgivings? They could have attended the meeting and presented their grievances or worn black flags.

After all, it was a forum for interaction with other chief ministers and the Centre.

The BJP sees the boycotts of the Aayog meeting and the inauguration of the new Parliament building as part of the Opposition's "Modi hatred".

There have been several questions about the relevance of the Niti Aayog and its predecessor Planning Commission. While the Commission was seen as a White elephant, the Niti Aayog is seen as a toothless institution. The Planning Commission had two primary duties-implementation of the five-year plan and providing Finances to the states. NITI Aayog has no constitutional or statutory sanction. Its stated aim is to construct a dynamic and robust nation. Unlike the Planning

Commission, it has no financial role. It is mainly the country's premier think tank. The Aayog has two hubs: "Team India Hub" and "Knowledge and Innovation Hub".

In addition to developing long-term, strategic plans for the Government of India, the Aayog supports a federal cooperative structure. Critics say that it should focus on the implementation rather than only concentrating on the recommendations of the policies.

India has emerged as a major global economy. The Aayog will be unable to transform an unequal society into a modern economy. It cannot influence public or private investment or policymaking. It needs to answer specific questions like why 90% of the workers are in the unorganized

sector. Aayog should evolve into a much stronger organization. It lacks the states' confidence, particularly from the non-BJP chief ministers, petition among the states worked well during the Covid period.

The Prime Minister held Zoom conferences and involved the chief ministers in pandemic relief. However, politics entered on Covid relief later with the non-BJP chief ministers complaining of step-motherly treatment from the Centre.

Overall, the NITI Aayog needs to evolve into a much stronger organization. If it wants to be more effective, it requires the trust of the non-BJP chief ministers and their active participation. Only then a strong centre and strong states will emerge.

HK court rejects Lai's bid to end national security trial

A Hong Kong court on Monday rejected a jailed publisher's request to terminate his national security trial, pressing ahead with a landmark case seen as part of Beijing's crackdown on the city's pro-democracy movement. Jimmy Lai, the 75-year-old founder of the now-defunct newspaper Apple Daily, faces up to life in prison if convicted under a Beijing-imposed national security law. His lawyers earlier filed an application to halt the trial, raising concerns that his case was being heard by three judges approved by the city's leader, instead of a jury.

When Hong Kong returned to China in 1997, it was promised that trials by jury, previously practiced in the former British colony, would be maintained under the city's constitution. But in a departure from the city's common law tradition, the security law



allows no-jury trials for national security cases. On Monday, Judges Esther Toh, Susana D'Almada Remedios and Alex Lee unanimously rejected Lai's request, saying there was no reason to believe they "would be biased, actually or apparently, against" Lai. The national security law was enacted in June 2020 following months of anti-government protests calling for an

investigation into police conduct during the unrest and universal suffrage. It outlaws secession, subversion, terrorism and foreign collusion to intervene in the city's affairs, and has been used to stamp out dissent. Lai is accused of conspiring with others to call for sanctions or blockades, or engage in hostile activities, against Hong Kong or China. He also faces a

charge of collusion with foreign forces to endanger national security, and a separate sedition charge under a colonial-era law that is also increasingly used to crush the opposition. Under the security law, the secretary for justice may direct national security cases to be tried without a jury if state secrets need to be protected, foreign forces are involved, or if the personal safety of jurors needs to be protected. In such cases, they will be heard by a panel of three hand-picked judges. Earlier this month, Robert Pang, one of Lai's lawyers, pointed to the lack of transparency in the appointment of the judges, saying that might affect the public's confidence in the judiciary and the judicial process. Pang also alleged the executive's move to block British lawyer Timothy Owen from representing Lai could be fairly described as "persecution."

Explosions rattle Kyiv during day

Explosions rattled Kyiv during daylight Monday as Russian ballistic missiles took aim at the Ukrainian capital, hours after a more common nighttime barrage of the city by drones and cruise missiles. Debris from missiles intercepted by Ukrainian air defenses fell in Kyiv's central and northern districts during the morning, landing in the middle of traffic on a city road and also starting a fire on a building's roof, the Kyiv military administration said. At least one civilian was reported hurt. The blasts unnerved some locals, already under strain after being awakened by the night attack. "After what happened last night, I react sharply to every siren now. I was terrified, and I'm still trembling," shared Alina Ksenofontova, a 50-year-old woman who took refuge in the Kyiv subway with her dog Buklik. The central station, Tetralna, was crowded with sheltering locals. Artem Zhyla, a 24-year-old who provides legal services abroad, took his laptop with him and kept working underground. "I heard two or three explosions, went to the bathroom, and then I heard five or seven more explosions. That's when I realized something terrible was happening," he said.

Like many others in the capital, he feels exhausted and stressed. However, he has no intentions of giving up and plans to attend his yoga class to recharge. "This is certainly not enough to break us," he said. Russia used Iskander short-range missiles in the morning attack, the spokesman for Ukraine's air force said on local television. The missiles were fired from north of Kyiv, Yuriy Lhnat said without clarifying if he meant Russian territory. Kyiv lies around 380 kilometers (236 miles) from the Russian border. During the previous night, air defenses brought down more than 40 targets as Russian forces bombarded Kyiv with a combination of drones and cruise missiles in their 15th

nighttime attack on the capital so far this month, said Serhii Popko, the head of Kyiv's military administration. On Saturday night, Kyiv was subjected to the largest drone attack since the start of Russia's war. At least one person was killed, local officials said. Kremlin's strategy of long-range bombardment has brought many sleepless nights for Ukrainians. Over the winter, Russian forces aimed their missiles and drones at power plants and other infrastructure. The apparent goal was to weaken Ukraine's resolve and compel the Ukrainian government to negotiate peace on Moscow's terms, but Ukrainians swiftly and defiantly repaired the damage.

Russia issues arrest warrant for Lindsey

Moscow (AP): Russia's Interior Ministry on Monday issued an arrest warrant for US Sen Lindsey Graham following his comments related to the fighting in Ukraine. In an edited video of his meeting on Friday with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy that was released by Zelenskyy's office, Graham, a Republican from South Carolina, noted that "the Russians are dying" and described the U.S. military assistance to the country as "the best money we've ever spent." While Graham appeared to have made the remarks in different parts of the conversation, the short video by Ukraine's presidential office put them next to each other, causing outrage in Russia. Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov commented Sunday by saying that "it's hard to imagine a greater shame for the country than having such senators." The Investigative Committee has moved to open a criminal inquiry against Graham, and the Interior Ministry followed up by issuing a warrant for his arrest.

Tinubu sworn in as Nigerian President

Abuja (AP): Nigeria's Bola Tinubu has been sworn in as president of Africa's most populous country at a period of unprecedented challenges, leaving some citizens hopeful for a better life and others sceptical that his government would perform better than the one he succeeded. The former governor of Lagos, Nigeria's economic hub, Tinubu, 71, was sworn in as Nigeria's president in Abuja, the capital city, in the presence of thousands of Nigerians and several heads of governments. He succeeds President Muhammadu Buhari to lead a country that by 2050 is forecast to become the third most populous nation in the world, tied with the United States after India and China.

Judge appointed in SA to oversee weapons-for-Russia probe

Cape Town (AP): South African President Cyril Ramaphosa has appointed a judge to oversee an inquiry into allegations that the country supplied arms to Russia on a ship that docked secretly at a naval base in December. The allegations were made this month by the United States' ambassador to South Africa, who said he was sure that weapons and ammunition were loaded onto the Russian-flagged cargo ship Lady R when it docked at the Simon's Town naval base near Cape Town late last year. Ambassador Reuben Brigity indicated that the US had intelligence to sustain the

inquiry and he said he would bet his life on the accuracy of his claim that weapons were loaded onto the ship. The Lady R container-carrying ship is under US sanctions for being tied to a company that has transported weapons to aid the Russian war effort in Ukraine. South Africa has denied there was any government-sanctioned deal to provide weapons to Russia, although it hasn't categorically ruled out that an unofficial transaction took place involving another entity. Judge PMD Mojapelo, a former Supreme Court of Appeal judge, was appointed chairman of a three-member panel to investigate

the incident, Ramaphosa's office said in a statement on Sunday. A lawyer and a former minister of justice were also appointed. The panel has six weeks to complete its investigations and another two weeks from then to provide a report to Ramaphosa, the president's office said. "The panel has been tasked to establish persons who were aware of the cargo ship's arrival, and, if any, the contents to be off-loaded or loaded, the departure and destination of the cargo," Ramaphosa's office said. Ramaphosa ordered the inquiry because of the seriousness of the allegations and "the impact of this matter on South

Africa's international relations," his office said. South Africa could be in breach of international law and its own laws regarding weapons sales if it is found to have supplied arms to Moscow for the war in Ukraine. The incident has strained relations between the US and South Africa, which is Africa's most developed economy and a key Western partner on the continent. South African Defence Minister Thandi Modise has said the Lady R was visiting to deliver an ammunition shipment from Russia that was ordered by South Africa in 2018 but was delayed because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Erdogan turns away reform-minded challenger to win another term

AP ■ ANKARA

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan turned away a challenger who sought to reverse his authoritarian-leaning changes, securing five more years to oversee the country at the crossroads of Europe and Asia that plays a key role in NATO. Erdogan prevailed by winning more than 52% of the vote in Sunday's presidential runoff, which came two weeks after he fell short of scoring an outright victory in the first round. A majority of Turkish voters in the second round chose him over challenger Kemal Kilicdaroglu, showing their support for a man who they see as a strong, proven leader. Voters were divided between loyalty to Erdogan, who has ruled for two decades, and hopes for the opposition candidate, who promised to return to democratic norms, adopt more conventional economic policies and improve ties with the West. With his immediate political future secure, Erdogan must now confront skyrocketing

inflation that has fuelled a cost-of-living crisis and rebuild in the aftermath of a devastating earthquake that killed more than 50,000 people. In two speeches — one in Istanbul and one in Ankara — Erdogan thanked the nation for entrusting him with the presidency again. "We hope to be worthy of your trust, as we have been for 21 years," he told supporters on a campaign bus outside his home in Istanbul. He said the divisions of the election are over, but he continued to rail against his opponent. "The only winner today is Türkiye," Erdogan said outside

the presidential palace in Ankara, promising to work hard for Türkiye's second century, which he called the "Turkish century." The country marks its centennial this year. Supreme challenges lie ahead, starting with the economy that has taken a beating from what critics view as Erdogan's unorthodox policies. He also must tend to massive rebuilding efforts in 11 provinces hit by the Feb. 6 earthquake that levelled entire cities. Kilicdaroglu said the election was "the most unjust ever," with all state resources mobilised for Erdogan.

Spanish PM Sánchez calls early election

Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez on Monday called an early general election for July 23 in a surprise move after his Socialist party took a serious battering in local and regional elections. Prior to Sunday's debacle, Sánchez had insisted that he would ride out his four-year term with leftist government coalition partner United We Can, indicating that an election would be held in December. The woes for Sánchez and his PSOE party come as Spain is due to take over the rotating presidency of the European Union on July 1. Sánchez said he had spoken to King Felipe VI and would hold a special Cabinet meeting later on Monday to dissolve parliament. "I have taken this decision given the results of the elections held yesterday," Sánchez from the Moncloa presidential palace. The local and regional elections saw Spain taking a major swing to the right and made the

leading opposition right wing Popular Party, or PP, the main political force in the country. "This is unexpected," said Ignacio Jurado, a political scientist at Madrid's Carlos III University. "Sánchez is trying to short circuit the PP's rise as soon as possible." In the municipal vote, the Popular Party, or PP, won 31.5 per cent of votes compared with 28.2 per cent for the Socialists. This was a 1.2 percentage point decrease for PSOE on 2019, but almost a nine point increase for the PP, which benefited from the collapse of the centrist Citizens party. The PP won in seven of the 12 regions contested and dominated in several regions previously won by PSOE including Valencia, Aragon and La Rioja. It remains to be seen whether PP will have to rely on far-right party Vox to form regional governments. Spain's regional governments have enormous power and budgetary discretion over education, health, housing and policing.

China to send astronauts to moon by 2030

China on Monday announced plans to send a manned mission to the moon by 2030 for lunar scientific exploration, amid its deepening space race with the West. The announcement was made by Lin Xiqiang, Deputy Director of the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA), as China is preparing to send a third set of astronauts to its space station on Tuesday. Li told the media at the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre in Inner Mongolia ahead of the launch of the spacecraft that takes the three astronauts to the space station called Tiangong that China has recently initiated under the lunar landing phase of its manned lunar exploration programme. The overall goal is to achieve China's first manned

landing on the moon by 2030 and carry out lunar scientific exploration and related technological experiments, he was quoted as saying by the state-run Xinhua news agency. China's manned lunar mission came as the US space agency NASA aims to send a second manned mission to the moon by 2025 to explore the south pole for frozen water. For its part, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has announced plans to launch its ambitious Chandrayaan-3 mission aimed at demonstrating critical technologies to land the spacecraft on the south pole. Chandrayaan-3 mission carries scientific instruments to study the thermo-physical properties of the lunar regolith, lunar seismicity, lunar surface plasma environment and ele-



mental composition in the vicinity of the landing site. China in the past successfully launched uncrewed missions to the moon which included a rover. China has also sent a rover to Mars. According to Lin, the goal of China's moon mission also includes mastering the key technologies such as earth-moon manned roundtrip, lunar surface short-term stay,

human-robot joint exploration, accomplishing multiple tasks of landing, roving, sampling, researching, returning, and forming an independent capability of manned lunar exploration. In 2021, China and Russia announced plans to set up an International Lunar Research Station. Russian space agency Roscosmos said in March 2021 that it has signed an agreement with China's National Space Administration to develop research facilities on the surface of the moon, in orbit or both. Lin said China's manned lunar landing will promote the leapfrog development of manned space technology from near-Earth to deep space, deepening human understanding of the origin and evolution of the moon and the solar system, and contribute Chinese wisdom to the development of lunar science, he said. The aim of space powers, such as the US, Russia and China, is to set up bases on the Moon for astronauts to live in, Dr McDowell, an astronomer at the Harvard-Smithsonian Centre for Astrophysics in the US told BBC earlier. "The Moon is being used as a stepping stone to places like Mars," he says.

Talks possible if Imran apologises: Dar

Finance Minister Ishaq Dar has hinted that negotiations with former prime minister Imran Khan to end the political crisis were possible if he took "corrective measures" and apologised to the nation for the May 9 violence in which sensitive military installations were attacked.

Dar made this assertion during a Geo News programme on Sunday, the day when Pakistan's ruling coalition rejected Khan's offer for dialogue, saying talks were held with politicians, not terrorists.

Khan, the chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party constituted a seven-member team to hold talks with the government - for developing a consensus on a date for general elections - amid a massive crackdown on his party for the May 9 violence following his arrest. The crackdown launched after May 9 violence protests have thrown PTI into a deep existential crisis with dozens of key party leaders quitting the party daily. The prominent leaders who have quit the party include Secretary General Asad Umar,

senior leader Fawad Chaudhry and former minister Shireen Mazari. "If he (Khan) takes corrective measures and apologises to the nation for the May 9 carnage, negotiations could be held," Dar said. Dar noted that before that fateful day (May 9), the government negotiated with PTI with "sincere intentions" and the two sides agreed on all matters except the date of the election.

The minister said peaceful protest was everyone's right, but attacks on armed forces' installations should not be condoned. On May 9, violent protests erupted after paramilitary Rangers arrested 70-year-old Khan from the Islamabad High Court premises in connection with a corruption case.

His party workers vandalised a dozen military installations, including the Lahore Corps Commander House, the Mianwali airbase and the ISI building in Faisalabad in response to Khan's arrest. The mob also stormed the Army headquarters (GHQ) in Rawalpindi for the first time. Thousands of Khan's supporters were arrested following the

violence that the powerful Army described as a "dark day" in the history of the country.

The ambiguities of the federal government's policy came into sharp focus, with Railways Minister Khawaja Saad Rafique asserting that there was no way talks could be held with Khan under the current situation.

"There used to be an environment and agenda for holding parleys on any issue. But the existing atmosphere is not suitable for talks," the Dawn newspaper quoted him as saying.

Earlier this month, the National Assembly, the lower house of Pakistan's Parliament, passed a resolution vowing to try May 9 rioters under the existing laws including the stringent Army Act and the Official Secrets Act. Khan, a cricketer-turned-politician, was ousted from power in April last year after losing a no-confidence vote in his leadership, which he alleged was part of a US-led conspiracy targeting him because of his independent foreign policy decisions on Russia, China and Afghanistan.

Ex-PM lashes out at Govt

Islamabad (PTI): Pakistan's former prime minister Imran Khan on Monday lashed out at the PML-N-led coalition government for trashing the rule of law and destroying the economy under the watch of the powerful establishment.

Khan took to social media to make a statement that focussed on the real issues faced by the country than highlighting the dire affairs of his party which is facing the wrath of the state for attacking institutions.

"Completely abandoning the rule of law, this fascist government is committed to a one-point agenda of crushing the Tehreek-e-Insaf, leaving General Musharraf's martial law far behind," he tweeted. He went on to add that cash-strapped Pakistan's economy is falling headlong into the abyss of destruction.

Khan said that the dollar is being sold at Rs 315 in the open market, while it is available for Rs 320 to Rs 325 for those who



do not have an identity card and there is a difference of 30 rupees per dollar between the official and open market rates.

"This dollarisation of economy means no local or foreign investment into the country, which will result in contraction of the GDP and worse, lead to hyperinflation," he added.

Turning to his favourite theme of stonewalling his opponents, Khan said the leaders of the coalition government have billions of dollars stashed abroad, and understandably they are not pushed. "The question is, how on earth is the Pakistani establishment allowing the coun-

try to head towards a complete economic meltdown?" he asked.

The statement comes as the government and Khan have traded barbs over the alleged ill-treatment of women supporters of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf who were still in jail after being arrested in the wake of violent protests on May 9. Khan is under pressure to keep his party intact as dozens of leaders have abandoned it after the crackdown launched to arrest those involved in attacks on military installations.

His statement is apparently an effort to tell his supporters that Khan was still relevant and can take the country out of trouble. Khan, a cricketer-turned-politician, was ousted from power in April last year after losing a no-confidence vote in his leadership, which he alleged was part of a US-led conspiracy targeting him because of his independent foreign policy decisions on Russia, China and Afghanistan.

Japan PM's son to resign after public outrage

Tokyo (AP): Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said Monday his son is resigning as his executive policy secretary to take responsibility for using the prime minister's residence for a private party at which the merrymaking was exposed in magazine photos that triggered public outrage.

Shotaro Kishida, his father's executive secretary for political affairs and eldest son, invited a group of people including relatives to a year-end party on Dec 30 at the Prime Minister's Official Residence.

Photos published by the weekly Shukan Bunshun magazine showing Kishida's son and his relatives posing on red-carpeted stairs in an imitation of the group photos taken of newly appointed Cabinets, with his son at the center - the position reserved for the prime minister. Other



photos showed guests standing at a podium as if holding a news conference.

"As secretary for (the prime minister's) political affairs, a public position, his actions were inappropriate and I decided to replace him to have him take responsibility," Kishida told reporters Monday night. He said his son will be replaced with another secretary, Takayoshi Yamamoto, on Thursday.

Lanka drafting Bill to curb religious slander

Colombo (PTI): Sri Lanka is drafting a new legislation to curb the growing incidents of religious slander and online vitriol, according to the country's religious affairs minister. The move comes after a stand-up comedian Nathasha Edirisooriya allegedly made certain derogatory remarks on religions, which she uploaded online.

Edirisooriya offered an apology, but a complaint was filed and she was taken into custody on Sunday while trying to fly out of the country.

Lanka's Minister of Buddhist Affairs, Religious, and Cultural Affairs Vidura Wickramanayake on Sunday said a legislation would soon be passed to curb the growing incidents of religious slander in the country. They will stop all incidents of demeaning religion on social media," he asserted. The controversy surrounding Edirisooriya's comments is not a one-off incident.

Earlier this month, Pastor Jerome Fernando, a self-styled Godman, was accused of derogatory comments on Lord Buddha, which went viral on social media. On May 15, President Ranil Wickremesinghe ordered the Criminal

Investigation Department to launch an immediate investigation into the matter, arguing that such statements could create religious conflicts in the country.

Like Edirisooriya, Fernando also offered an apology. He has, however, fled to Singapore and filed a fundamental rights petition to block his impending arrest. In January, a popular Youtuber Sepal Amarasinghe was sent to police custody for making disparaging comments on the Sacred Tooth relic of Lord Buddha.

The Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic is a Buddhist temple in Kandy.

It is located in the royal palace complex of the former Kingdom of Kandy, which houses the relic of the tooth of the Buddha. The arrest came after parliamentarians across the aisle unanimously condemned Amarasinghe's comments on his YouTube channel. Amarasinghe's YouTube channel has nearly 80,000 subscribers and the outspoken man is well-known on social media for his unorthodox views that challenge what he claims are parochial traditions and customs. Over 74 per cent of Sri Lanka's 22 million population are Buddhists.

N Korea notifies Japan about plans to launch satellite

North Korea on Monday notified neighbouring Japan that it plans to launch a satellite in coming days, which may be an attempt to put its first military reconnaissance satellite into orbit. Defence Minister Yasukazu Hamada said he ordered Japan's Self Defence Force to shoot down the satellite or debris, if any entered Japanese territory.

Japan's coast guard said the notice it received from North Korean waterway authorities said the launch window was from May 31 to June 11, and that the launch may affect waters in the Yellow Sea, East China Sea and east of the Philippines' Luzon Island.

The coast guard issued a safety warning for ships in the



area on those dates because of the possible risks from falling debris. Japan's coast guard coordinates and distributes maritime safety information in East Asia, which is likely the reason it was the recipient of North Korea's notice. The launch a satellite into space, North Korea would have to use long-range missile technology banned by UN

Security Council resolutions. Its past launches of Earth observation satellites were seen as disguised missile tests.

Japan's Chief Cabinet Secretary Hirokazu Matsuno said the launch would violate UN resolutions and was a "threat to the peace and safety of Japan, the region and the international community."

Japan was already on standby for falling missile debris from North Korean launches earlier this year and has deployed missile defence systems such as land-to-air PAC-3 and ship-to-air SM-3 interceptors in southwestern Japan and in the East China Sea.

Matsuno said it was possible the satellite would enter or pass above Japan's southwestern islands including Okinawa, where the United States has major military bases and thousands of troops.

South Korea warned Monday that North Korea will face consequences if it goes ahead with its launch plan in violation of the UN Security Council resolutions that ban the North from conducting any launch using ballistic technology. "Our government strongly

warns North Korea against a provocation that threatens peace in the region and urges it to withdraw its illegal launch plan immediately," a ministry statement said.

It said South Korea will cooperate with the international community to resolutely cope with any North Korean provocation.

In a three-way telephone conversation later Monday, the chief nuclear envoys of South Korea, the United States and Japan agreed to cooperate to help promote a unified, resolute international response to a North Korean satellite launch.

They strongly urged North Korea to refrain from what they termed "an illegal launch" that would threaten regional peace, according to South Korea's Foreign Ministry.

Sudanese army, rival force under pressure to extend truce

Sudan's warring sides were under pressure Monday to extend a shaky cease-fire in their battle for control of the country, after two key international mediators signalled impatience with persistent truce violations. In a joint statement Sunday, the United States and Saudi Arabia called out Sudan's military and its rival, the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces, for specific breaches of a week-long truce that is to expire Monday evening rather than issue another general appeal to respect agreements.

Sudan descended into chaos after fighting erupted in mid-April between the military, led by Gen. Abdel-Fattah Burhan, and the RSF, commanded by Gen. Mohammed Hamdan Dagalo. The fighting has killed at least 866 civilians and wounded thousands more, according to the Sudan Doctors' Syndicate, which tracks civilian casualties. The toll could be much higher, the medical group said. The conflict has turned the

capital, Khartoum, and other urban areas into battlefields, forcing nearly 1.4 million people to flee their homes to safer areas inside Sudan or crossing into neighbouring countries. Early on, foreign governments raced to evacuate their diplomats and nationals as thousands of foreign residents scrambled to get out of the African nation.

For weeks, the United States and Saudi Arabia have been mediating talks between the military and the RSF in the Saudi port city of Jeddah. So far, there have been seven declared cease-fires, all of which have been violated to some extent.

In Sunday's statement, the US and Saudi Arabia noted that the military continued to carry out airstrikes, while the RSF was still occupying people's homes and seizing properties.

Fuel, money, aid supplies and vehicles belonging to a humanitarian convoy were stolen, with theft occurring both in areas controlled by the military and by the RSF, the statement said.

Birmingham gets first British Indian Lord Mayor

London: Birmingham has got its first British-Indian Lord Mayor in Councillor Chaman Lal after the local councillors of the West Midlands city of England chose him to represent it as its first citizen.

Lal, who is from the Ravidassia community of British Sikhs, was born in the village of Pakhowal in Hoshiarpur before he moved to the UK, where he has served as a local councillor for many years.

The Labour Party politician was first elected in 1994 and in the most recent local elections was re-elected Councillor for the Soho and Jewellery Quarter Ward. "It is a very proud moment for me and our family, as a son of an army officer born in India, but made in Birmingham," Lal said in his acceptance speech at a mayoral ceremony last week. "I am an adopted Brummie, and I never thought that one day I would become the Lord Mayor of my adopted city. I would like to thank my fellow councillors for electing me as their first citizen which happens to be the highest civic role," he said.

Many evacuated as Philippines warns of floods, landslides

Manila (AP): Philippine officials began evacuating thousands of villagers, shut down schools and offices and imposed a no-sail ban Monday as Typhoon Mawar approached the country's northern provinces a week after battering the US territory of Guam.

The typhoon is packing maximum sustained winds of 155 kph and gusts of up to 190 kph but is forecast to spare the northern mountainous region a direct hit. Current projections show the typhoon veering northeast by mid-week toward Taiwan or southern Japan.

Authorities warned of dangerous tidal surges, flash floods and landslides as it blows past Cagayan and the northernmost province of Batanes from Tuesday to Wednesday. Gustly winds lashed eastern villages of Cagayan on Monday, causing an old and unoccupied warehouse in a wharf to collapse and prompting more villagers to move to evacuation centres.

Nearly 5,000 people have sought shelter in Cagayan, Batanes and other provinces, said Assistant Secretary Raffy Alejandro of the Office of Civil Defence. He said the number was expected to rise given the precautionary evacuations that

were underway in flood- and landslide-prone regions. Classes and office work, except those involved in disaster-preparedness, have been suspended. Flights to and from the provinces have been cancelled and fishing and passenger vessels prohibited from sailing.

Climbers honoured on 70th anniversary of first Mount Everest ascent

Nepal honoured record-holding Sherpa guides and climbers on Monday to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the first ascent of Mount Everest by Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay. On May 29, 1953, Hillary, a beekeeper from New Zealand and his Sherpa guide Norgay scripted history by becoming the first human beings to scale the treacherous terrain of the world's highest mountain peak.

Thousands of Sherpa guides and government officials participated in a rally here to mark the 70th anniversary. They waved banners that read "Save the Himalayas."

Among those honoured include Sherpa guides Kami Rita, who climbed Everest for

a record 28 times, and Sanu Sherpa, who climbed all the world's 14 highest peaks twice. Hari Budha Magar, who became the first double above-

the-knee amputee to climb Everest, was also honoured by Nepal's Tourism Minister Sushila Sirpali Thakuri. On the occasion, a silver badge

encrypted with the logo of Everest was distributed to dozens of Nepalese and foreign Everest summiteers.

Those receiving the badge include an Indian citizen, who climbed the 8,848.86 metres-high Everest in 2021.

Russian, North American and French climbers were also bestowed with this honour.

"For the first time, we are honouring local and foreign climbers who have climbed Everest with medals," Mohan Lamsal, the general secretary of the Nepal Mountaineering Association, said.

A special programme was also organised to honour the families of Norgay and Hillary, officials said. Since their herculean efforts seven decades ago, 7,621 mountaineers have scaled Everest.

RBI saw gaps in corporate governance at banks despite norms: Das

PTI ■ MUMBAI

The Reserve Bank has found gaps in banks' corporate governance despite issuing guidelines on the matter, Governor Shaktikanta Das said on Monday. Addressing directors of bank boards, Das said such gaps, which have been mitigated, could have caused "some degree of volatility".

He also hit out strongly against "smart accounting" to conceal stress and bloat financial performance.

"It is... a matter of concern that despite these guidelines on corporate governance, we have come across gaps in governance of certain banks, with the potential to cause some degree of volatility in the banking sector," Das said at the meeting specially convened by the

Reserve Bank. Bank boards and management should not allow such gaps to creep in, he said, adding that the RBI has taken up such matters with the banks at an individual level in the past.

It is the joint responsibility of the chairman of the board and the directors, both whole-time and non-executive or part-time directors, to ensure robust governance in banks, the governor noted.

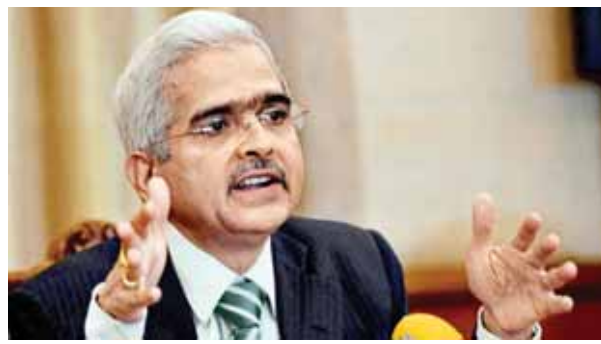
The RBI has also found banks adopting "smart accounting methods" to "artificially boost financial performance", Das said, revealing more about the modus operandi.

Banks try to conceal the real status of stressed loans by getting two lenders together to evergreen each other's loans by

sale and buyback of loans or debt instruments, persuading good borrowers to enter into structured deals with a stressed borrower to conceal the stress, adjust borrower's repayment obligations by using internal or office accounts, he said.

"We have also come across a few examples where one method of evergreening, after being pointed out by the regulator, was replaced by another method. Such practices beg the question as to whose interest such smart methods serve. I have mentioned these instances to sensitise all of you to keep a watch on such practices," he said.

Without naming any particular case, Das said the RBI has noticed the dominance of chief executives in board discussions and decision-making



and rued that the boards do not assert themselves.

"We would not like this type of situation to develop. At the same time, there should not be a situation where the CEO is inhibited from doing his duties," he added.

Das advised banks to be cautious in the pursuit of their growth strategies, pricing and

while the Reserve Bank has nudged banks to adjust their business strategies in some cases where they were creating "avoidable vulnerabilities" by being aggressive, the central bank does not interfere in the commercial decision-making of the banks. Employees cannot be rewarded for increasing short-term profits without adequate recognition of the risks and long-term consequences, Das said.

In the remarks that come weeks after turbulence in the American banking sector, Das also asked bank boards to be wary about basic aspects like asset-liability mismatches, saying as suboptimal ALM can lead to serious liquidity risks and destabilising effects on the bank itself.

"...Developments in the

USA have also demonstrated that aggressive growth strategies with disproportionate or excessive focus on the bottom lines and/or market capitalisation often leads to build up of vulnerabilities," he said.

He was quick to add that the Indian banking sector is "strong and stable" with capital buffers at 16.1 per cent, gross non-performing assets at 4.41 per cent and provision coverage ratio at 73.20 per cent at the end of December 2022.

"It is in times such as these that complacency may set in. We have to bear in mind that risks often get overlooked or forgotten when things are going well. Therefore, boards of directors of banks and their senior management should maintain a constant vigil on external

risks and build-up of internal vulnerabilities, if any," he said.

Meanwhile, the RBI in a statement said that the governor acknowledged the role played by the banks in supporting the economy and maintaining resilience, along with improved financial performance in the face of several adverse shocks in recent times.

He exhorted the directors of banks to further strengthen the governance and assurance functions (risk management, compliance and internal audit) so that the banks are able to identify and mitigate risks at an early stage.

The governor also emphasised the need for banks to ensure continued financial and operational resilience, the statement said.

Sebi levies ₹15L fine on an individual for violating norms

Markets regulator Sebi on Monday slapped a fine of Rs 15 lakh on an individual for illegally mobilising funds from the public through a collective investment scheme in the matter of Alchemist Infra Realty Ltd.

In addition, the regulator asked Balvir Singh (individual) to pay the penalty within 45 days.

In the matter related to Alchemist Infra, Sebi initiated adjudication proceedings against Alchemist and its directors, including Singh, for the violation of CIS (Collective Investment Scheme) rules.

In February 2021, the markets watchdog passed an order and slapped a fine of Rs 1 crore on Alchemist and its directors, including Balvir Singh, as they were engaged in fund mobilising activity from the public by floating and launching collective investment schemes without obtaining registration from the regulator.

The order came after the Securities Appellate Tribunal (SAT) set aside Sebi's order



against Singh for violating CIS norms and directed the markets watchdog to pass a fresh one.

Sebi's Adjudicating Officer Soma Majumder said, "I find that Noticee (Balvir Singh), being a director of Alchemist during the period from April 2008 to February 2009, was responsible for the conduct of the firm, which engaged in fund mobilising activity from the public through investment contracts by floating/sponsoring/launching collective investment schemes without obtaining registration from the regulator during his tenure."

"Therefore, the allegation that Noticee has violated CIS regulations stands established," she added.

In a separate order, the regulator slapped fines totalling Rs 10 lakh on Bull Research Investment Advisors and its directors for flouting regulatory norms.

The order came after Sebi had conducted an examination of pending complaints in SCORES against Bull Research, a registered Investment Adviser under the markets regulator.

Ashif Shaikh, Vinit Satpute and Sandeep Kushwaha were the directors of Bull Research Investment Advisors.

The regulator issued the show cause notices to the noticees (Bull Research, Shaikh, Satpute and Kushwaha) in February 2023.

FDI equity inflows fell 22% to \$46 bn in 2022-23: DPIIT

Foreign direct investment (FDI) into India declined by 22 per cent to USD 46 billion in 2022-23, dragged by lower inflows in computer hardware and software, and automobile industry, according to the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) data.

The FDI inflows stood at USD 58.77 billion during 2021-22.

Total FDI inflows, which include equity inflows, re-invested earnings and other capital, declined by 16 per cent to USD 70.97 billion in the last fiscal as against USD 84.83 billion in 2021-22.

During April-March 2022-23, Singapore emerged as the top investor with USD 17.2 billion FDI.

It was followed by Mauritius (USD 6.13 billion), the US (USD 6 billion), the UAE (USD 3.35 billion), the Netherlands (USD 2.5 billion), Japan (USD 1.8 billion), UK (USD 1.73 billion), Cyprus (USD 1.27 billion), Cayman island (USD 772 million), and Germany (USD 547



million), the data showed.

The FDI inflows have contracted in 2022-23 from Mauritius, the US, the Netherlands, the Cayman Islands, and Germany.

Though the computer software and hardware sector attracted the highest inflows of USD 9.4 billion during the last financial year, these inflows are down as compared to USD 14.5 billion in 2021-22.

Similarly, FDI in the automobile industry dipped significantly to USD 1.9 billion in 2022-23 as compared to about USD 7 billion in 2021-22. The other sectors which recorded dip in the inflows in the last fiscal include construction (infrastructure) activities, and metallurgical industries.

However, the inflows have recorded growth in sectors including services (USD 8.7 billion), trading (USD 4.8 billion),

G20 members to discuss common framework to define startups

G20 member countries, including India and the US, are holding consultations to arrive at a common framework to define startups with a view to promoting the growth of new ventures, a senior official said. This issue among others would come up for discussion during the Startup20 Engagement Groups, under India's G20 presidency, third meeting on June 3-4 in Goa.

A common framework would help investors and other stakeholders of the startup ecosystem in the G20 member countries.

Briefing media about these meetings, Startup20 India Chair and Mission Director Atal Innovation Mission, Niti Aayog Chintan Vaishnav said that there are five task forces under this group - foundation, alliances, finance, inclusion, and sustainability.

"The idea of the foundation is to come up with a start-up definition framework which



is applicable across different economies. When you talk about the global startup ecosystems coming together, working together, becoming interoperable, you realize that there are no common definitions of startups across these nations," he told reporters here.

The attempt is to provide a framework of choices from which a country can create a definition, he added.

Under alliances, the countries are trying to ensure that there is some form of platform to promote cooperation between key stakeholders of startup ecosystem such as incubators, and regulators.

Similarly, the idea of the finance task force is to unlock financing of startups in general for nations to invest in these enterprises and also cross-border investments.

"There are many other financial issues like taxation of startups is a very major issue across the world," he said adding in the inclusion part, "we are trying to focus" on marginalised groups and empowering these groups by following best global practices.

Further, the idea of the sustainability task force is to say which are those startups that

are willing to be measured by SDGs (sustainable development goals).

When asked about the possible outcomes from the summit meeting at Gurugram on July 3-4, he said it included adoption of policy communique on startups; a common framework to define startups; there is hope that there will be a global innovation centre or a global network of innovation centre that would implement what Startups 20 group wants to take forward into action.

"Also a network of global points of contact. If a startup wants to go to another country, is there a way to enter into that ecosystem? Some kind of common financing of startups, how much money to allocate, how do you invest across borders; and mechanisms to support these marginalised communities and also support those startups that help the world achieve the SDGs," he added.

"We are hoping for such kind of outcomes," Vaishnav said.

Under India's G20 presidency, Startup20 serves as a prime opportunity to foster collaboration, exchange ideas, and shape the future of startups and entrepreneurship on a global scale.

The focal point of the meeting will be to build consensus on the Draft Policy Communique, which the Startup20 recently published asking the public for feedback.

The meeting will feature a startup showcase, exciting talks as part of the Startup20x series, cultural experiences, and discussions on the implementation and benefits of the ideas outlined in the document.

Dignitaries from state, central, and international levels are expected to be present at the meeting, adding to the significance of the event.

The last date for providing views on the draft was May 27. The final version of the Policy Communique will incorporate the valuable inputs received from stakeholders across nations.

BHEL logs over 17% rise in new orders in 2022-23

State-run engineering firm Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd (BHEL) logged over 17 per cent growth in new orders bagged in 2022-23 to Rs 23,548 crore compared to the previous year due to its diversified business approach.

BHEL secured new orders worth Rs 20,078 crore in 2021-22, according to a company statement.

"BHEL secured orders worth Rs 23,548 Crore (excluding taxes) during 2022-23 in its power, industry and export segments and the company ended the year with a total order book of over Rs 91,336 crore (excluding taxes)," it stated.

The latest outstanding order book has crossed Rs 1,00,000 crore (excluding taxes) with the finalisation of the prestigious Vande Bharat trainset order in April 2023, it explained.



The BHEL-TWL (BHEL-Titagarh Wagons Ltd.) consortium has been awarded an order valued at about Rs 23,000 crore (excluding taxes) for 80 Vande Bharat Trains in one of the biggest Railway tenders for manufacturing-cum-maintenance of Vande Bharat Trains.

This order will give further impetus to the company's diversification drive, it pointed out.

As part of its diversification strategy, BHEL has also leveraged its Pressurised Fluidised Bed Gasification technology for coal gasification and has entered into MoUs (memorandum of understanding) with Coal India and NLC India for development of coal gasification projects.

During the fiscal year, the BHEL commissioned 1,580 MW of power-generating equipment, in addition to synchronising captive/solar projects of 298 MW.

With this, the company's global installed power generating capacity has gone up to 195 GW.

Sensex, Nifty extend gains to 3rd day on global scrip rally

Benchmark stock indices Sensex and Nifty rose for a third straight day on Monday amid positive trends in the US markets and continuous foreign fund inflows. Rising for a third session, the 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 344.69 points or 0.55 per cent to settle at 62,846.38 as 20 of its constituents ended in the green. During the day, it jumped 524.31 points or 0.83 per cent to 63,026.

The broader NSE Nifty gained 99.30 points or 0.54 per cent to end at 18,598.65 with 34 of its components closing in green.

In the three days of gains, Sensex rose by 1,072 points or 1.8 per cent while Nifty spurred by 313 points or 2 per cent. From the Sensex pack, Mahindra & Mahindra climbed 3.71 per cent after the



company reported an 18 per cent jump in its consolidated profit for the March quarter and the highest-ever annual profit of Rs 10,282 crore in FY23.

Titan, Tata Steel, HDFC, UltraTech Cement, State Bank of India, TFC, IndusInd Bank, NTPC, HDFC Bank and Bajaj Finserv were the other major gainers. HCL Technology, Power Grid, Maruti, Wipro, Tata Consultancy Services, ICICI Bank, Infosys, Tech Mahindra and Hindustan Unilever were the laggard.

"The domestic benchmarks experienced a strong rally and came close to life-time highs, primarily driven by positive global cues and robust predictions of domestic economic growth."

"An in-principle approval from US leaders for raising the US debt ceiling has generated optimism among global investors, who are now anticipating the next monetary plan of the Fed and economic data points," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services.

Rupee falls 4 paise to close at 82.64 against US dollar

On Friday, the rupee closed at 82.60 against the US currency.

The dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.02 per cent to 104.23.

Global oil benchmark Brent crude futures declined 0.40 per cent to USD 76.64 per barrel.

Antoine Griezmann and Nahuel Molina struck for Atletico in their win over Real Sociedad, who struggled to create much of note, perhaps aware of Villarreal's struggles.

Victory leaves Atletico third, a point behind Real Madrid.

Captain Sergio Busquets and defender Jordi Alba also played at home for the last time, in the club's penultimate league match of the season, and were awarded warm farewells by the sell-out crowd.
Ansu Fati struck twice in the first half and Gavi added one after the break as the Catalans triumphed in style.
Marc-Andre ter Stegen earned his 26th clean sheet of the season, equalling the all-time record in the division, set by Deportivo La Coruna's Francisco Liano in the 1993-94 campaign.
The only bad news for Barcelona came when defender Alejandro Balde was taken off injured in the first half -- he will be out for at least six weeks and miss Spain's Nations League final four games in June.
Camp Nou, inaugurated in September 1957, has been one of football's most iconic stadiums since then.
Alba departed in tears when he was substituted in the final stages with the crowd chanting his name, while Busquets followed and was given an ovation of his own.
The duo could yet appear in Barcelona's final game of the season at Celta Vigo next weekend, but for nearly 90,000 supporters, this is the end of an era.
Busquets has won La Liga nine times and the Champions League on three occasions, making over 700 appearances for the club.
Alba departs with six La Liga trophies and one Champions League triumph among other silverware.
The duo both gave speeches on the pitch after the game.
"Since I was little I've dreamed of playing a game in this stadium that we're saying goodbye to temporarily," said Busquets.
"We're already the best club in the world, with the best players, and now we'll have a stadium on that level."

Giroud seals win at Juve and CL spot for Milan

Olivier Giroud secured Champions League qualification for AC Milan with the only goal in Sunday's 1-0 win at troubled Juventus.
Giroud guided home a brilliant header from Davide Calabria's cross in the 40th minute to guarantee Milan at least fourth place and complete Italy's line-up in Europe's top club competition next season.
It was the one moment of quality in an otherwise drab match in Turin in which little of consequence happened apart from Giroud's 12th league goal of the season.
Stefano Pioli's side, who were knocked out of this year's Champions League in the semi-finals by Inter Milan, join their local rivals, Lazio and champions Napoli on the continent's big stage.
They are six points ahead of fifth-placed Atalanta with one match left in what has been a long season and one in which their title defence collapsed after the World Cup.
"This was the first time we truly tried to be competitive in two tournaments and we were lacking something," said Pioli.
"We can enjoy the win and qualification, but it was a strange season for many reasons."
Juve meanwhile stay seventh and in the Europa Conference League spot after being deducted 10 points for illicit transfer activity by the Italian Football Federation on Monday.
Massimiliano Allegri's side can still reach the Europa League spots as they are one point behind Roma in sixth, although the spectre of more punishment for financial irregularities hangs over the Turin giants.
LECCE SAFE
Lecce ensured Serie A survival after late penalty drama gave them a 1-0 win over Monza, while a crushing late draw with Empoli took Verona's survival battle to the final day.
Lorenzo Colombo rammed home the spot-kick which maintained Lecce's Serie A status in the 11th minute of stoppage time after Christian Gytkjaer

was penalised for handball following a VAR check.
Former Denmark forward Gytkjaer had a penalty of his own saved by Wladimir Falcone with six minutes of regular time remaining.
That allowed Colombo to fire Lecce five points clear of the drop zone and cause coach Marco Baroni to sink to his knees in joy and grief for his recently deceased father.
"I thought about my father because I lost him recently... I felt him by my side in that moment," Baroni told DAZN.
Verona sit in the final relegation spot after a gut-wrenching Gian Giacomo Magnani own goal in the sixth minute of injury time which snatched a 1-1 draw for safe Empoli.
They are level on 31 points with 17th-placed Spezia, whom they might have to face in a play-off devised this season to decide who ends up in 18th place between teams who finish on the same points.
OSIMHEN NOT ENOUGH
Victor Osimhen's brace wasn't enough for Napoli as the newly-crowned Italian champions threw away a two-goal lead to draw 2-2 with Bologna.
Nigeria forward Osimhen took his season's tally to 30 in all competitions with finishes in the 14th and 54th minutes. However Lewis Ferguson pulled one back in the 63rd minute and Lorenzo De Silvestri headed the hosts level in his final home match as a Bologna player.
Napoli won their first league title since 1990 this season but owner Aurelio De Laurentiis said that coach Luciano Spalletti will leave to take a year's sabbatical.
"He's a free man, he's given us something and I thank him, it's right that he does what he wants," said De Laurentiis to state broadcaster Rai.

Mbappé wins his 4th Ligue 1 player of the year award

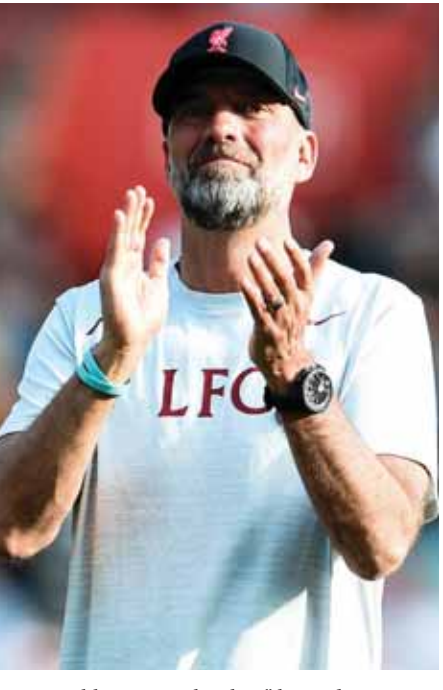

Kylian Mbappe was voted the Ligue 1 player of the season for the fourth successive time Sunday after finishing Paris Saint-Germain win a record 11th French title.
The France star has scored 28 goals in the league this term and is on course to finish as the division's top scorer for the fifth season running.
"It's a pleasure, I always wanted to win, to write my name into the league's history. But even with all the ambition I have I didn't expect to win so quickly," said Mbappe on receiving his award.
Mbappe, scorer of 40 goals this campaign, snubbed Real Madrid at the end of last season and signed a new three-year contract to stay with PSG.
According to reports, the 24-year-old's contract will run out next year unless he exercises an option to stay until 2025.
Asked about his future at the awards ceremony, Mbappe replied: "I will be here again next season."
He is the first four-time winner of a prize first awarded in 1994, sur-



passing Zlatan Ibrahimovic who won the accolade on three occasions with PSG.
Franck Haise of Lens was named coach of the season after leading the club to second place and a return to Champions League football for the first time in two decades.
Lens goalkeeper Brice Samba was also honoured while Paris Saint-Germain left-back Nuno Mendes earned the best young player award.
He was one of four PSG players in the team of the season alongside Mbappe, Lionel Messi and Achraf Hakimi.

Klopp won't take break from management despite Liverpool's troubled season

Jurgen Klopp insists he does not need a break from management as he looks to put Liverpool back on track after their troubled season.
Klopp's side missed out on Champions League qualification after finishing outside the top four for the first time in a full season under his leadership.
A 4-4 draw at Southampton on the last day of the season stretched Liverpool's unbeaten top-flight run to 11 games, but they had to settle for a fifth-place finish in the Premier League.
Klopp is the Premier League's longest-serving manager and there had been claims the intense German might be willing to walk away from Liverpool due to burn-out.
But, asked if he needs time off from football, Klopp said: "No, no, no, not at all. Honestly, I'm completely fine.
"If you'd asked me 11 games ago, 'do you want to have a break?', I would have thought about it, to be honest."
"But I'm absolutely fine, full of energy, I have a break - I don't have training and these kind of things."
"I will find time to reenergise and then we start again in July."
Liverpool's fifth-placed finish was their lowest since they finished eighth in 2015-16, the season during which Klopp replaced Brendan Rodgers at Anfield.
Despite their difficulties, Klopp takes heart from the way his squad stuck together during some difficult moments.
"There is not a lot to learn (from the season) but a lot of clubs when the expectations are as high as ours when things don't go well pretty quickly



Leicester face major changes after relegation, says Evans

Leicester defender Jonny Evans admits the former Premier League champions face major changes after their relegation to the Championship.
Evans' team were condemned to the second tier on Sunday after Everton's 1-0 win against Bournemouth rendered the Foxes' 2-1 victory over West Ham irrelevant.
Leicester are only the second former Premier League champions after Blackburn to be relegated from the top-flight.
Their fairytale title success seven years ago seems a distant memory as they face up to a first season in the Championship since 2014.
A large number of players including Evans and Youri Tielemans are out of contract and likely to leave the King Power Stadium in the close-season.
England midfielder James Maddison and talented winger Harvey Barnes look set to be sold to help balance the expected financial losses of at least £60 million (£74 million).
Leicester boss Dean Smith also faces an uncertain future, with his short-term contract set to expire after he replaced Brendan Rodgers in April.
Former Manchester United



centre-back Evans, 35, revealed the Leicester squad had said their goodbyes in the dressing room ahead of a likely close-season exodus.
"It is a tough thing to take. There was silence for a long time in the dressing room afterwards. We know there are a lot of players out of contract," he said.
"There are going to be a lot of changes in the football club."
"It was an opportunity for everybody to say goodbye really. A lot of us don't know where we are going to end up."
"I said to the boys it has been an amazing five years but the club now has decisions to make."
"I don't think they probably know what they are going to do."

Djoker battles into French Open 2nd round

Novak Djokovic started his bid for a men's record 23rd Grand Slam singles title with a straight-sets victory over Aleksandar Kovacevic in the French Open first round on Monday.
Two-time Roland Garros champion Djokovic held off a late rally from his American opponent on Court Philippe Chatrier to clinch a 6-3, 6-2, 7-6 (7/1) victory. He has still not lost in his opening match of a major since the 2006 Australian Open.
"I'm very motivated to stay in this tournament for a long time, it's just the start now," said Djokovic after kicking off his 19th consecutive French Open campaign. "I'm happy. I've started well and hope I can improve further for the next match."
The 36-year-old will face Hungarian Marton Fucsovics, who he has beaten four times in as many meetings, in the second round. Djokovic is only seeded third at Roland Garros this year despite



the absence of his great rival and 14-time winner Rafael Nadal through injury, behind world number one Alcaraz and Daniil Medvedev.
He is tied with Nadal for most men's Slam singles trophies and just one behind the 23 of Serena Williams. Margaret Court holds the all-time record of 24.
Kovacevic, the world number 114 playing in his first Grand Slam match, battled hard but could not put Djokovic under sustained pressure until it was too late.
Elsewhere, Canadian 10th seed Felix Auger-Aliassime suffered a third defeat at the opening hurdle in four visits to Roland Garros as he lost 6-4, 6-4, 6-3 to Fabio Fognini.
The unpredictable Italian, who himself has lost in the first round six times in nine tournaments so far this season, pulled off a shock win on Court Simonne Mathieu. The world number 52 will next face Australian Jason Kubler.

Chelsea hire Pochettino as new club manager

Chelsea hired Mauricio Pochettino as their new manager on Monday as the Argentine accepted the daunting task of reviving the troubled Premier League club.
Pochettino agreed a two-year contract with an option for an additional year and will return to the Premier League four years after being sacked by Chelsea's London rivals Tottenham. The 51-year-old had been out of work since being dismissed by Paris Saint-Germain in July 2022.
"Mauricio is a world-class coach with an outstanding track record. We are all looking forward to having him on board," Chelsea co-owners Todd Boehly

and Behdad Eghbali said in a statement.
Pochettino, who will begin his new role on July 1, replaces Frank Lampard after the former England midfielder returned to Chelsea as caretaker boss until the end of the season.
Lampard was Chelsea's third manager of a dismal cam-



paign that featured Boehly sacking Thomas Tuchel in September and then axing his successor Graham Potter in April after less than seven months in charge.
Pochettino emerged as the favourite after Chelsea held talks with the former Spain manager Luis Enrique and Julian Nagelsmann, who was sacked by Bayern Munich in March.
Pochettino verbally agreed to take charge at Chelsea in April, but the appointment was put on hold until the end of the season.
With the Blues wrapping up their lacklustre Premier League campaign with a draw against Newcastle on Sunday, Pochettino flew into England to officially seal the deal.

SUDHARSAN'S 96 TAKES GT TO 214/4

B Sai Sudharsan led the charge with a terrific 96 as defending champions Gujarat Titans set Chennai Super Kings an imposing target of 215 in the IPL final here on Monday.

Sudharsan struck eight fours and six sixes to make his runs from a mere 46 balls, forging crucial partnerships along the way and helping GT find their feet in the summit clash, after Shubman Gill perished for 39 and Wriddhiman Saha failed to go beyond his half-century.

Put in to bat, Gujarat Titans posted a formidable 214/4.

A big moment arrived in the game as early as in the second over when Tushar Deshpande had Gill flicking a delivery on the leg side, as if executing a well-planned delivery, but with no success.

Deepak Chahar, positioned at short fine leg, spilled a regulation chance but Gill also could not hurt CSK the way he did Mumbai Indians a few nights ago, here.

Saha piled further pressure on the bowler, collecting 16 runs off the third over and providing the Titans momentum.

Gill followed with three consecutive fours off Deshpande, but Chahar's poor luck continued when spilled a tough return catch off Saha's bat.

The two drops indeed proved costly as GT reached 62 for no loss after the powerplay.



However, the brilliance of MS Dhoni ended Gill's sensational IPL with the bat, stumping the batter for a 20-ball 39 (7x4s) off Ravindra Jadeja (4-0-38-1) in the seventh over.

With 890 runs in 17 matches with three centuries and four fifties, an average of 59.33 and strike rate of 157.80, the 23-year-old Gill finished with the second best performance for any batter in IPL history.

Saha brought up his second fifty of this IPL in the 13th over but his 64-run stand with B Sai Sudharsan ended in the 14th over, with Chahar getting him caught by Dhoni.

Saha hit five fours and a six to make 54 from 39 balls.

The second highest run-scorer for Gujarat Titans this season, Sudharsan accelerated to his third fifty in this IPL, bringing it up with consecutive fours off Matheesha Pathirana.

The young left-handed batter from Chennai recovered well from a sedate start to accelerate after the 14th-over mark, hitting three fours and a six off Deshpande and two sixes against Theekshana. In fact, Sudharsan was on 36 from 25 balls when Saha was dismissed, and on the next 21 balls he faced, the 21-year-old smacked 60 runs.

However, in the final over, Sudharsan's carnage ended as Pathirana pinned him in front of the wickets for his first breakthrough in the game.

GT skipper Hardik Pandya scored an unbeaten 12-ball 21.

Unadkat was also engaged in a discussion with head coach Rahul Dravid and bowling coach Paras Mhambrey. Cheteshwar Pujara, who has been playing for Sussex in the English

county circuit to prepare for the final, also was seen arriving in the training ground.

Umesh and Shardul Thakur were among the first batch of Indian players to arrive for the WTC final.

Skipper Rohit Sharma and young Mumbai opener Yashasvi Jaiswal have also reached, while the last batch including Ravindra Jadeja, Shubman Gill, Mohammad Shami, KS Bharat and Ajinkya Rahane, will be leaving on Tuesday following the IPL final in Ahmedabad. Jaiswal was included in the squad as a stand-by player after Rituraj Gaikwad informed BCCI about him getting married on June 3-4.

India had finished runners-up in 2021 after losing the WTC final to Kane Williamson-led New Zealand by eight wickets in Southampton two years ago.

India won't play any warm-up game as the English County Championship is on and also this being an ICC event, the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) is under no obligation to arrange practice matches for the visiting team.

ICC expecting full crowds for at least first four days of WTC final

The International Cricket Council is expecting a sell-out crowd for at least the first four days of the World Test Championship final between India and Australia at The Oval in London from June 7.

The ICC has also kept a reserve day for the title clash if weather plays spoilsport.

"We have been working very closely with the local organising committee (ECB) to ensure it is a great spectacle for the fans. We are expecting full crowds for each of at least the first four days. We know we are heading in the right direction. It has created huge interest in terms of fans,

and two best teams in the world will be slugging it out, it is set to be a fantastic event.

"We hope the weather stays clear so we can get the full amount of cricket, though we have a reserve day to make up for lost time," said Wasim Khan, ICC general manager of cricket, in a select media interaction.

The final of the inaugural edition also involved India, who finished runners up to New Zealand in Southampton two years ago. Asked why the game is being played in the UK for the second edition in a row, Wasim said the location goes well with the scheduling of the final. The Oval also serves as a neutral venue for both teams.

Sindhu, Srikanth eye good show in Thailand

Following a decent show in Malaysia, star Indian shuttlers, including PV Sindhu and Kidambi Srikanth, will look for consistency as they begin their campaign in the Thailand Open Super 500 badminton tournament beginning here on Tuesday.

While Sindhu had reached the semi-finals last week, Srikanth signed off with a quarterfinal finish in Kuala Lumpur and the duo will look to go deep in the draw to keep their hopes of winning a title.

Double Olympic medallist Sindhu had come close to breaking her title jinx when she reached the finals of Madrid Spain Masters but Srikanth has struggled since his epic run on way to the Thomas Cup victory last year.

The 27-year-old from Hyderabad, who slipped two places to world number 13 this week, will face Canada's Michelle Li in the opening round, while Srikanth will look to take a few tips from HS Prannoy when he takes on Malaysia



Masters finalist Weng Hong Yang of China.

While a win for Sindhu is likely to put her face-to-face with China's sixth seed Wang Zhi Yi, Srikanth will have to compete with third-seeded Chinese Shi Yu Qi if he can cross the opening hurdle.

Lakshya Sen, who has slipped out of the top 20 following a dismal run this season, will open against Chinese Taipei's Wang Tzu Wei. Sen had lost to Angus Ng Ka Long of Hong Kong in straight games last week.

Orleans Masters winner Priyanshu Rajawat will also be in the fray this week when he squares off against Malaysia's Ng Tze Yong in the opening round.

After skipping Malaysia Masters, India's top doubles pair of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty will be back in action this week, taking on France's Lucas Corvee and Ronan Labar.

Men's pair of Krishna Prasad Garaga and Vishnuvardhan Goud Panjala, women's pair of Ashwini Bhat K and Shikha Gautam are also in the fray.

WTC Final: Ponting picks both Jadeja and Ashwin in playing XI

Former Australia skipper Ricky Ponting believes that India will play both Ravindra Jadeja and Ravichandran Ashwin in the World Test Championship final against Australia, starting June 7.

Ponting, a three-time ODI World Cup winner, also reckons that India should try out left-handed batter-keeper Ishan Kishan for the marquee match scheduled at the Oval.

"I think they will pick Jadeja and Ashwin because Jadeja can hold that No. 6 batting spot. His (Jadeja) batting has improved that much that they can pick him as a batter now who might just bowl a few overs if required," Ponting told in ICC Review Podcast.

Ponting then explained the reason behind his view.

"There is no doubt that Ashwin is a more skilled and better Test bowler than what Jadeja is, but if Jadeja can hold down that batting spot and then

as the game goes on, getting into the fourth and fifth day, if it does start to turn, then you have got that really high-class second spin bowling option if required," he explained.

Having played a host of Ashes games at the Oval during his playing days, Ponting expects a lot of turn on offer.

"Historically, the Oval pitch has been a very good batting wicket. It's generally offered something for the fast bowlers on day one, not a lot. But I have also played some games there where it has turned a lot. If it starts a little bit dry, it can turn a lot."

With no Rishabh Pant available for this game, Ponting feels Ishan Kishan with superior batting skills, should get a go.

"If I was them [India], knowing the importance of this game — and you have to win this Test match — I'd be going with Ishan Kishan in this game," Ponting said.

"He provides that little bit of X-factor that you need when you



might be pushing for a win in a Test match. Obviously, if Rishabh Pant is fit, he is playing, and he provides that X-factor for India.

"But with him not being there, and this is no blot on Bharat whatsoever, but I think Kishan just provides that little bit more X-factor, who'd do a good job with the gloves but can provide that really high-scoring run rate that is required in a one-off Test match to push for a win."

In a one-off Test, Ponting wants as many x-factor players as possible.

"I'd be going with as many X-factor players as I could and put some real pressure back on Australia."

Ponting was happy to see Ajinkya Rahane make a comeback to Test squad but also felt that his positive intent in first phase of IPL, did help his cause.

"Jinks (Rahane) has had an incredible IPL as well. It's funny, isn't it, how IPL runs can now get you picked back into a Test match squad," Ponting said.

"Jinks has been on the outer for the last couple of years in Test cricket, but everyone saw how confident he looked and how well he played in the IPL and that was enough to get him back in."

Ponting feels that Test cricket is easier for Rahane compared to his recent exploits in IPL for CSK.

"He (Rahane) has been there and done it before in Test cricket. It was probably a bigger hurdle for him to climb to get back into playing really good T20 cricket than it is for him to go back and play good Test cricket."

"His make-up is much more suited to the Test game than it is to T20 cricket. He has rediscovered some confidence and if he does get picked, I won't be surprised to see him get runs in that Test match. He has always been a really high-quality player and we saw him even with his leadership qualities in Australia, in that last series to turn things around."

Anderson, Robinson expected to be fit for England's Ashes bid

England head coach Brendon McCullum expects James Anderson and Ollie Robinson to be fit for the Ashes clash with Australia despite ruling the pace bowlers out of this week's Test against Ireland.

Anderson strained his groin while on Lancashire duty and Robinson suffered an ankle issue playing for Sussex earlier this month.

The pair will remain sidelined when England host Ireland at Lord's in a four-day match prior to the first Ashes Test.

The five-match series against Australia begins on June 16, but McCullum is confident Anderson and Robinson can return in time for the opener in Birmingham.

"For the first Ashes Test, I think they should be fit," McCullum said on Monday.

"They won't be fit for this one against Ireland. We'll just have to monitor it over this next sort of while, but we've got some great options right throughout the squad."

"When I first took over this job, people said there wasn't much depth in English cricket and I disagree with that completely."

"I think there is an immense amount of depth and we've got plenty of good options throughout the squad."

England already have fitness concerns over a number of other bowlers, with Jofra Archer and Olly Stone struggling with elbow and hamstring problems respectively.



With Anderson and Robinson ruled out, Stuart Broad will lead the bowling attack against Ireland but Mark Wood will have to be assessed before a final decision is made on his fitness.

"He is bowling over there at the moment and seems to be getting through his work so hopefully he will be fine too," McCullum said of Wood.

"We've still got a couple of days and will make the decision when we need to, but he seems to be progressing well."

All eyes were on captain Ben Stokes during England's training session on Monday.

There are doubts over how much he will bowl this summer following an Indian Premier League series where he only played twice

and sent down just one over for Chennai Super Kings.

McCullum remains positive the talismanic all-rounder can still make an impact with the ball.

Asked if Stokes will bowl against Ireland, McCullum responded: "I don't know. You'll have to ask Stokes. He's progressing well too. He looks really fit as well, looks in great order and has a big smile on his face."

"He is delighted to be back around the group and as our leader, having that sort of energy he brings is fantastic so again we'll monitor that and see what happens. I think he'll bowl at some stage throughout the summer, yeah, no doubt."

"He is a world class all-rounder and if he is able to bowl, fantastic. If not, we'll find a way."

BWF extends ban on 'spin serve'

The Badminton World Federation (BWF) has decided to extend the ban on the new 'spin serve' until the conclusion of the Paris Olympics and Paralympic Games next year. The ruling will be applied from the Thailand Open Super 500 tournament starting in Bangkok on Tuesday.

Ahead of the Sudirman Cup, the BWF had put an interim ban on the use of the experimental serve until May 29, 2023.

"After consultation with the badminton community, BWF Council believed it best to forbid the 'spin serve' for another 15 months so as to not impact the Olympic and Paralympic qualifying periods and the Games themselves," the BWF said in a statement.
