Shah promises jobs, compensation for riot victims, deployment of more forces in Manipur

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday visited Churachandpur, the scene of some of the worst rioting in the recent ethnic conflict which broke out in Manipur earlier this month, and held talks with Kuki civil society leaders. He also held a series of discussions with different Meitei groups, women groups and prominent personalities earlier during the day in Imphal before flying to the headquarters of the hill district by the same name.

Among others, Shah who was accompanied by Intelligence Bureau (IB) chief and Union Home Secretary, met political and social leaders from the Kuki community to understand their grievances and find ways to bring peace to the northeastern state, which has witnessed a series of clashes between Meiteis and Kukis.

He held three rounds of talks with various groups such as Indigenous Tribal Leaders' Forum (ITLF), Kuki Students' Organisation (KSO) and other civil society organisations. He also met five Kuki MLAs from the BJP.

"We demanded total separation from Manipur — both political and geographical. We also sought President's Rule as the law and order has totally collapsed in the State," ITLF secretary Muan Tombing told PTI. The Home Minister on his part, requested the Kuki soci-

ety to maintain peace for the "next 15 days" with an assurance of sending more security personnel for the safety of common people, he added. Asked why Shah mentioned only "15 days", Tombing said, "He told us that the CBI will be entrusted with carrying out a detailed probe to find out the reasons behind this prolonged clash. Besides, a judicial enquiry will also be announced."

Earlier in the day, the Government announced it will provide a compensation of Rs 10 lakh to the next of kin of those who died in the ethnic conflict and a job to a family member. The compensation amount will be borne equally by the Centre and the State, an official release said. The decision was taken at a meeting between the Union Home minister and Chief Minister N Biren Singh in the presence of the Council of Ministers on Monday night.

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Let SC judge-led panel probe riots: Cong to Prez

Top Congress leaders on Tuesday met President Droupadi Murmu and sought her intervention in helping bring normalcy in violence-hit Manipur, and called for the constitution of a high-level enquiry commission headed by a serving or retired Supreme Court judge to probe the incident.

A delegation of Congress leaders led by party Chief Mallikarjun Kharge met the President and handed over a memorandum to her seeking her urgent intervention and handed over a 12-point charter of demands to be taken immediately to help bring peace and normalcy in the



north-eastern State. "Though there were several lapses in the management of the situation at the early stages of violence, leading to the present imbroglio. Now it is not the time to point fingers, but to act. If the suggestions above are implemented in earnest, peace can perhaps be restored once again."

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CDS: Challenges in Manipur have not disappeared

In the backdrop of tension prevailing in Manipur, Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) General Anil Chauhan on Tuesday said challenges in the State have not disappeared, but expressed hope that things will settle down in some time. He also noted that the situation in the north-eastern State now is not related to insurgency.

These observations by him came as the death toll due to ethnic clashes in Manipur which began on May 3 went up to 80 and Home Minister Amit Shah who is now on a visit to the State held talks with various groups.

The CDS was in Pune on Tuesday to review the passing out parade of 144th course of National Defence Academy (NDA). Asked about situation in Manipur, he told reporters that, "The Army, Assam Rifles were deployed in Manipur before 2020. Since the challenges of northern borders were far more, we were able to withdraw Army. Since insurgency situation had normalised, we were able to do that."

The situation now in Manipur is "not related to insurgency". It is a clash between two ethnicities and a situation of law and order, he said. "We are helping the State Government with the problem," the CDS said.

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UWW hits out at detention of grapplers, threatens WFI ban

Khap, farmer leaders convince wrestlers not to immerse medals in Ganga river

On a drama-filled Tuesday, some of India's best wrestlers accompanied by hundreds of supporters gathered on the banks of the Ganga, threatening to immerse their World and Olympic medals in the holy river but refrained after being convinced by Khap and farmer leaders who sought five days to address their grievances.

Meanwhile, in evidence of growing support to the grapplers the global governing body for wrestling, United World Wrestling (UWW) on Tuesday issued a statement on the grapplers' protest, saying that "events of these last days are even more worrying," and the legendary Anil Kumble said he was "dismayed" by the treatment meted out to the protesting wrestlers at Jantar Mantar where they were manhandled and detained by police for trying to march towards the new Parliament building and hold a 'Mahila Mahapanchayat'.

Earlier, Olympic champion shooter Abhinav Bindra, Indian football captain Sunil Chhetri and former India all-



rounder Irfan Pathan, too, had expressed solidarity with the grapplers. Significantly, the UWW's strong statement condemning the "treatment and detention of the wrestlers" came on a day the top sportspersons like Rio 2016 bronze medalist Sakshi Malik, Tokyo 2020 medallist Bajrang Punia and world championship medallist Vinesh Phogat almost immersed their medals in the Ganga river.

"For several months, United World Wrestling has followed with great concern the situation in India where wrestlers are protesting over allegations of abuse and harassment by the President of the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI)," the statement said before adding: "UWW will request further information about the next elective general assembly from the IOA and the Ad-hoc Committee of the WFI. The 45-day deadline that was initially set to hold this elective assembly shall be respected. Failing to do so may lead UWW to suspend the federation, thereby forcing the athletes to compete under a

neutral flag. It is reminded that UWW already took a measure in this situation by reallocating the Asian Championship planned in New Delhi earlier this year."

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SKM calls for June 1 nationwide dharna in support of grapplers

New Delhi: The farmers' outfit Samyukta Kisan Morcha (SKM) on Tuesday called for nationwide demonstrations on June 1 in support of the wrestlers who have been demanding the arrest of BJP MP and WFI chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, accused of sexually harassing women grapplers.

The SKM, in a statement, said it has given the call for the nationwide agitation "to secure democratic right to protest by the Indian wrestlers" and all other sections of society and to "demand the arrest of Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh".

Delhi girl's killer bought knife 15 days ago: Police

The 20-year-old AC mechanic arrested for his involvement in the horrific Shahbad Dairy murder case purchased the knife used in the killing of 16-year-old girl from Haridwar in Uttarakhand around 15 days ago, said the Delhi Police which is probing the case. Police said on Tuesday that they are yet to recover the knife, adding that Sahil dumped it near Rithala Metro Station after the killing on Sunday evening.

The accused had planned the murder two days ago after the girl rebuffed him in front of her friends and refused to mend her relationship with him, said police. "Since Sahil bought the knife days before the incident, it is not unlikely he was planning to kill her already, yet he is claiming he killed the girl in a fit of rage for her constantly ignoring him, they said. "The statements made by him are being verified since it is the initial stage of investigation. Sometimes he says she ignored him as he tried to approach her,



which angered him. But he also suspected her getting involved with her former boyfriend," the police said. Earlier, Sahil was produced at Delhi's Rohini court on Tuesday and was sent to police remand for two days. Police said they will be recreating the scene of crime and will also check Sahil's mobile phone and social media accounts to know whether he was in touch with other girls.

In a related development, the National Commission for Scheduled Castes has sought a report from the Delhi Government and the city police over the horrific killing of a teenage girl in the northwest part of the national Capital.

Politicos of all hues line up at victim's house, offer solace, compensation

Political parties from the spectrum — the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), the BJP and the Congress — jostled to seek mileage from the gruesome stabbing case by queuing up at the Shahbad Dairy area to meet with the victim's family members and even making announcements of compensation. The leaders from BJP, AAP, and Congress met and condoled with the bereaved family members of the 16-year-old girl who was killed in broad daylight in the Shahbad Dairy area of northwest Delhi.

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday announced an ex gratia of Rs 10 lakh to her kin to help them tide over the tragedy while Delhi Women and Child Welfare Minister Atishi met the girl's family members and assured that the Government would ensure that the accused receives the harshest of punishment.

BJP MP Hans Raj Hans also met the girl's family on Tuesday morning and said no amount of

money can bring the family its daughter back and also condemned the AAP for "politicising" the murder and using it to score political brownie points.

Delhi Congress president Anil Chaudhary, who also visited the family members of the victim, said, "Blame game begins" between Kejriwal and the L-G every time the "Government is held accountable." Delhi Commission for Women (DCW) Swati Maliwal too met the girl's family.

The girl was stabbed over 20 times and bludgeoned to death by a youth in a busy bylane of Shahbad Dairy area as passers-by looked on in fear and disbelief. "The Delhi Government will provide an ex gratia of Rs 10 lakh to the family of the victim and will try its best to get the culprit punished severely by the court. Best lawyers will be fielded for this case," Kejriwal in a tweet in Hindi announced. Atishi visited the family of the victim in the Shahbad Dairy murder case and offered her condolences.

10 Vaishno pilgrims dead, 66 hurt as bus falls off bridge

Ten Vaishno Devi pilgrims were killed and 66 injured on Tuesday as the bus they were travelling in veered off the road while crossing a bridge near Jhajar Kotli along the Jammu Srinagar National Highway. The death toll may go up as Government Medical College Hospital Principal Shashi Soodan said two of the injured admitted at the facility are critical.

The officials said the bus, which was on its way to Katra from Amritsar, met with the accident in the Jhajar Kotli area on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway between 6.30 and 7 am. Katra is a base camp for the pilgrims visiting the famous shrine atop the Trikuta hills in Reasi district.

They said most of the travellers were members of an extended family from Bihar's Lakhisarai and were on pilgrimage to Vaishno Devi temple for a ritual of a child. "The accident took place at Jhajar Kotli bridge. Ten people have died. Rescue operation is almost complete," Jammu Senior Superintendent of Police

Chandan Kohli told PTI. "We are investigating the reasons behind the accident."

Local residents, CRPF and police personnel rushed to the spot and launched the rescue operation.

"The troops of 137 CRPF battalion carried out the rescue operation to evacuate injured driver and passengers from the bus, which turned turtle and fell down from Jhajar Kotli bridge on highway," the force said in a tweet.

"Two persons were

brought dead while others died on the spot," said GMC hospital principal Soodan.

Jammu and Kashmir DGP Dilbagh Singh said prima facie the cause of accident appeared to be human error or over speeding.

It is possible that the driver might have dozed off on the wheel. It's a high flooyer kind of road from where the bus fell off, so the reason could also be overspeeding. It is part of our investigation," he told reporters.

India's Def exports up 23 times at ₹16K-cr

With the Government giving a push to self-reliance in defence sector, India's defence exports jumped 23 times and have reached an all-time high, surging from Rs. 686 crore in Financial Year(FN) 2013- 14 to nearly Rs 16,000 crore in FY 2022-23. Giving these details here, a Government statement said on Tuesday this remarkable 23-fold increase reflects India's progress in the global defence manufacturing sector. With exports reaching more than 85 countries, India's defence industry has shown its capability of design and development to the

world, with 100 firms exporting defence products at present.

To give a push to defence exports, the Government has taken a number of policy initiatives and brought reforms over the last 9 years. Export procedures have been simplified and made industry-friendly with end-to-end online export authorisation curtailing delays and bringing ease of doing business.

The Atmanirbhar Bharat initiatives have helped the country by encouraging indigenous design, development and manufacture of defence equipment in the country, thereby reducing dependency on imports in the long run. Continued on Page 2

Purana Qila reveals more of its historic past

Layers of history peeled as archeologists unearth ancient copper wheel, bone needle, kiln and coins

Historical Purana Qila in the National Capital continues to enthral archeologists who recently unearthed a range of ancient artifacts such as a spoked copper wheel of Kushana era, an arrowhead of the Rajput period and coins dating from the Mughal reign from the site.

India now plans to showcase this treasure trove of its rich heritage and cultural diversity to foreign delegates during the forthcoming G20 Summit to be held here in September. The fresh round of excavation

which began in late January is being led by archaeologist Vasant Swarnkar. This is the third round of excavations at the 16th Century Purana Qila, after excavations in 2013-14 and 2017-18 revealed nine cul-

tural levels, representing different historical periods, including the pre-Mauryan period, Mauryan, Sunga, Kushana, Gupta, post-Gupta, Rajput, Sultanate, and Mughal period. It is one of "rare archae-

ological sites" in India where layers of history spanning over 2,500 years have been found, Swarnkar said, adding that painted grey wares (PGWs) were found in the first round of excavations in 2013-14.

Union Minister G Kishan Reddy who visited the site on Tuesday morning said, "This is the only site in Delhi-NCR where one can witness the continuous history of Delhi from the pre-Mauryan to Mughal period through the excavated remains. The findings showcase the rich cultural heritage of our country." The ongoing excavation, initiated in January 2023, aims to

establish a complete chronology of site. Currently, structures from the early Kushana level have been exposed, with a depth of 5.50 meters reached thus far. This excavation is expected to provide further insights into the ancient city of Indraprastha.

The excavation has yielded a remarkable collection of artifacts. Notable findings include a stone image of Vaikuntha Vishnu, a terracotta plaque of Gaja Laxmi, a stone image of Ganesha, seals and sealings, coins, terracotta figurines of humans and animals, beads of various stones, TC, and a bone needle. Shinde's 22 MLAs, 9 MPs may quit party: Sena (UBT)

The Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena (UBT) on Tuesday claimed 22 MLAs and nine MPs from rival Shiv Sena were feeling suffocated due to "step-motherly treatment" by the BJP and could quit the group led by Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde.

Latching on to Shiv Sena MP Gajanan Kirtikar's remark that his party was getting step-motherly treatment, an editorial in Shiv Sena (UBT) mouthpiece 'Saamana' dubbed the Shinde group MLAs and MPs as "hens and cocks"

imprisoned in the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) coop and that it cannot be said when they could be slaughtered.

It said Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena (then undivided) severed ties with the BJP (in 2019) due to the same "step-motherly treatment" which became unbearable, and also for its safety and self-respect.

The Thackeray-headed Shiv Sena exited the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) in 2019 and joined hands with the Congress and Nationalist Congress Party to form a government in Maharashtra. After the split

in the Sena last year, Shinde joined hands with the BJP to become CM.

Kirtikar, the Lok Sabha member from Mumbai, on Friday said, "We are part of the NDA... So our work should be carried out accordingly, and (NDA) constituents should get a (suitable) status. We think we are being given step-motherly treatment."

The editorial in Saamana on Tuesday said reports are that Shinde group's 22 MLAs and nine MPs are feeling suffocated because of step-motherly treatment by the BJP and they have developed the mindset to quit the group"

Abhishek's aide arrested by ED

During the meeting, it was also decided to ensure that essential items such as petrol, LPG, rice and other foodgrains will be made available in large quantities to cool down rising prices.

In Imphal, Shah held consultations on Tuesday with stakeholders starting with a breakfast meeting with a group of women leaders at Raj Bhavan as part of his initiative to bring peace to the violence-hit State.

"Held a meeting with a group of women leaders (Meira Paibi) in Manipur. Reiterated the significance of the role of women in the society of Manipur. Together, we are committed to ensuring peace and prosperity in the State," Shah tweeted.

After that he met several CSO groups and prominent personalities from the Meitei community at the Secretariat before leaving for Churachandpur. "Had a fruitful discussion with the members of different civil society organisations today in Imphal. They expressed their commitment to peace and assured that we would together contribute to paving the way to restore normalcy in Manipur," he added.

After meeting Shah, Coordinating Committee on Manipur Integrity (COCO-MI) coordinator Jeetendra Ningomba said they requested the Union Home Minister to take appropriate measures to protect territorial and administrative integrity of the state. "We also

demanding immediate abrogation of the Suspension of Operations (SoO) agreement with the Kuki militant groups and devise effective counter-terror actions. Besides, we asked for replacement of Assam Rifles for their softness towards the Kukis," he added.

He claimed that Shah had assured the delegation there would be no compromise on Manipur's territorial integrity. Another group — award winning international and national sportspersons from Manipur — on Tuesday tried to meet him and later said at a press conference that they will return prizes given to them by government if state's territorial integrity is compromised.

The Congress party is a responsible political party and is ever ready to lend support to any initiative to restore peace, normalcy and harmony in the state of Manipur," the Congress memorandum to the President said.

They also called for firm and sustained efforts must be made to control violence in every part of the State for the immediate restoration of peace, harmony, and normalcy, and urged the President to ask the Centre to immediately take all possible measures to control and confine all militant groups (including those under SoO) and ensure that all armed civilian groups be stopped forthwith by taking appropriate action.

The state government must immediately take over the management and maintenance of all relief camps and provide proper health and sanitation facilities for all, the party suggested in its memorandum.

The letter and spirit of the existing Constitutional provisions related to the state of Manipur must be protected, and the trust between communities should be restored through reconciliation and dialogue, it also said.

"It is with a deep sense of loss and hurt that we humbly submitted a memorandum to the President of India, for her kind intervention so that the extraordinary situation confronting Manipur can be redressed and normalcy can be brought in urgently," Kharge said on Twitter after the meeting.

"As a responsible political party, the Indian National Congress is ever ready to lend support to any initiative to restore peace, normalcy and harmony in Manipur. We humbly submit the following 12 demands for immediate action. Only then there will be peace in the state," the Congress president said.

Among those who were part of the Congress delegation that met the President besides Kharge were former chief minister Ibobi Singh, Congress leader Mukul Wastnik, former deputy chief minister Gaikhangam and PCC president Keisham Meghachandra Singh, besides AICC in-charge for Manipur Bhakt Charan Das. Later, addressing a press conference, AIC general secretary Jairam Ramesh said the current situation in Manipur is a result of the divisive politics of the BJP which is clearly responsible.

Earlier, on Tuesday, Delhi Police said it will not allow the protesting wrestlers to shift their sit-in to India Gate as the national monument is not a site for demonstrations. According to police, alternative places for their dharna will be suggested if they asked. The Delhi Police will suggest alternative sites that are designated for protests such as Ramlala Ground and Burari, the source added.

In a related development, the Delhi High Court on Tuesday issued notices to its Registrar General, the city Government and the police in order to decide which court shall hear the plea of the minor wrestler, who is among the seven female grapplers who have accused Wrestling Federation of India President Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh of sexual harassment.

Later on Tuesday evening, Olympic medallists Sakshi Malik, Bajrang Punia and Asian Games gold medallist Vinesh Phogat arrived at Har ki Pauri to protest the inaction against outgoing Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief

Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, who has allegedly sexually harassed several women grapplers. Sakshi, Vinesh and her cousin Sangeeta were seen sobbing as their husbands tried to console them, even as scores of their supporters formed a cordon around them. The wrestlers stood for about 20 minutes in silence after reaching Har ki Pauri.

They then sat on the banks of the river holding their medals and looking distressed. Bajrang joined them after 40 minutes. Sombir Rathi, husband of Vinesh, was holding the Asian Games medals won by her wife. Sakshi was holding tightly the framed Olympic bronze medal she had won in 2016 in Rio.

The whole episode was reminiscent of the 1960 incident when the legendary Muhammad Ali, then Cassius Clay, threw his Olympic gold medal into the Ohio river to protest racial segregation in the US.

However, after spending an hour and 45 minutes, they returned after several khap and political leaders urged

them not to take such an extreme step. As the deadline for the immersion of the medals drew closer, senior farmer leaders Sham Singh Malik and Naresh Tikait sought five days' time from the grapplers to resolve the issue.

"The khap leaders put their turbans before us and said 'do not lose hope'. Keep the dignity of the turban and return. So we decided to wait," said wrestler Jitender Kinha, who has been a part of the protesting group. The wrestlers left without speaking with the media.

Close on the heels of the wrestlers announcing they would immerse their medals, sports ministry sources said the trophies and medals also belonged to the country.

"The medal that the wrestlers have won do not belong to them alone, but to the country, because they played under the Indian flag and their medals have been won with the efforts of not just the wrestlers' hard work but also the hard work of multiple people like their coaches, support staff," a ministry source told PTI.

"I would like to say that the armed forces and Assam Rifles have done an excellent job there and may have saved a large number of lives. Though the challenges in Manipur have not disappeared, it will take some time. Hopefully this will settle and the Government there will be able to do the job with the help of CAPF (Central Armed Police Forces) etc," he said.

In his address to the cadets, Chauhan spoke about the deployment of China's PLA (People's Liberation Army) along the northern borders. "We see the war in Europe, the deployment of China's PLA along the northern borders and geo-political crisis in neighbouring countries.

These crises present a challenge to India, but the armed forces are capable of maintaining the legitimacy of India's claims and peace in the region," he said.

Deployment of Chinese army on India's northern borders is not increasing day-by-day, he said adding deployment on the northern borders is at the same level as it was in 2020. "They haven't gone back. So, there is a challenge actually," he added.

She assured them of the full support of the Kejriwal Government and pledged to ensure justice for the victim. Atishi in her turn slammed Delhi Lt Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena and alleged that "such incidents can be averted if the L-G takes responsibility."

She expressed concern about the prevailing sense of insecurity among women in Delhi, and said, "Parents in Delhi are grappling with the question of whether they should send their daughters to college and work when girls continue to fall victim of violence on streets. As a woman and a Minister of elected Government, I earnestly request the L-G to fulfill his constitutional responsibility of improving law and order in Delhi instead of hindering the work of Kejriwal, and prioritising the safety of Delhi's daughters and women."

Another leader of the Aam Aadmi Party and Delhi Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj lashed out at the L-G over the horrific killing saying the people of Delhi have "lost faith" in the national capital's law and order system. "We urge the L-G to hold a Press conference and give us the information on how many police stations he has visited so far. The L-G has zero accountability. If this was some other country, people would start asking for the Home Minister's resignation.

These artefacts, along with pottery and other antiquities, offer valuable insights into the ancient civilization and trade activities at the site. Padma Vibhushan Professor BB Lal, who had also carried out excavation works inside the fort and its premises in 1954 and 1969-73, had co-related the finding of PGWs at various sites believed to be linked with the Mahabharata with that period, according to ASI officials.

About the artefacts that have been excavated in the last one month or so, Swarnkar said a "brick platform" and a "kiln" of the Kushana period were found at the site.

A fresh trench has also been dug at the excavation site, Swarnkar added. The Union Ministry of Culture in a statement said that during the closure of the previous season's excavation, "evidence of layers predating the Mauryan period was found."

Identified as an ancient settlement of Indraprastha, a continuous habitation of 2,500 years at Purana Qila was established in earlier excavations, it said. "The findings and artefacts unearthed in earlier excavations comprise painted grey ware, belonging to 900 BC, an earthen pottery sequence from

Maurya to Shunga, Kushana, Gupta, Rajput, Sultanates and Mughal periods," the Ministry had said. Swarnkar said in the first round of excavation at the Purana Qila site, "a ring well, beads and sealings" from the Mauryan era was found, adding, some of the artefacts carry "symbols from that era" but no text, so one cannot ascertain who the Mauryan ruler was.

Among the pre-Mauryan era artefacts, beads and a bead-making set up were unearthed in the previous round of excavation at Purana Qila which was built by Sher Shah Suri and Mughal emperor Humayun. Some artefacts from the modern period have also been dug out from the site. "We have found a British-era shoe polish box. The brand name is 'Parrot' with 'Made in England' printed on its side. Besides, we have also found a tiny porcelain sculpture and a cobblestone-made drain line at the upper level, said Swarnkar.

Reddy shared that the Purana Qila will be re-opened, and the excavated remains will be preserved, conserved, and provided with a shed. The site will be showcased as an Open Air Site Museum, allowing visitors to experience the rich historical legacy of Delhi.

A CRPF officer said 10 bodies have been recovered. Jammu and Kashmir Lt Governor Manoj Sinha approved an ex-gratia of Rs 5 lakh each for the next of kin of those who lost their lives and Rs 50,000 each for those seriously injured.

Condoling the deaths, he said in a tweet, "Extremely pained by the loss of lives in a tragic bus accident in Jhajar Kotli, Jammu. My heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families and prayers for speedy recovery of the injured. Directed district administration to provide all possible assistance and treatment to the injured."

Ravinder Panday, one of the travellers, said they felt that something hit the bus. "It lost balance and rolled down," he said. The accident site looked horrific with bodies trapped under the mangled remains of

the bus. Describing the accident, witnesses said the bus was in the left lane, but it crossed over to the right side after the driver lost control, hit the railing of the bridge and fell down into a gorge.

The front wheels came off and got stuck in the parapet of the bridge. "We were going to pay obeisance at the Mata Vaishno Devi temple and perform 'mundan' (rituals related to shaving a baby's hair for the first time). We were several families together," said Ramesh Kumar, who escaped unhurt.

For the journey to Katra, the vehicle, carrying a registration number of Uttar Pradesh (UP 81 CT 3537), should have taken a left turn nearly two km before the spot of accident, but passengers said the driver seemed to have lost the direction and was probably going to the Udhampur-Srinagar side of the highway.

The expenditure on defence procurement from foreign sources has reduced from 46 per cent of overall expenditure in 2018-19 to 36.7 per cent in December.

India, once known primarily as a defence equipment importer, now exports a wide range of major platforms, including aircraft like the Dornier-228, artillery guns, Brahmos Missiles, Pinaka rockets and launchers, radars, simulators and armoured vehicles besides others.

The global demand for India's indigenous products, such as the LCA-Tejas, Light Combat Helicopters and Aircraft Carriers is also on the rise, the statement said.

Egypt and Argentina have evinced interest in procuring 20 and 15 Tejas jets respectively. Moreover, India may export Advanced Light Helicopters to

the Philippines. Last year, BrahMos Aerospace and the Philippines signed a deal worth almost \$375 million for the Philippine Marines to buy three batteries of the BrahMos super-sonic cruise missile, and Kalyani Strategic Systems Limited won an export order worth \$155.5 million for supplying 155mm artillery guns, the first such order for an Indian firm.

In 2020, the Union cabinet gave its go-ahead to the export of Akash missile systems and also created a high-powered panel for swifter export approvals.

India has earmarked 75 per cent of this year's defence capital procurement budget for locally made weapons and systems, a move aimed at unlocking new opportunities for achieving self-reliance targets and ramping up the country's defence exports.

Meanwhile a new CCTV footage has surfaced online in which the accused could be purportedly seen talking to a person just minutes before committing the crime. In the fresh CCTV footage, Sahil is seen wearing a blue T-shirt and talking to a person at the corner of the bylane just minutes before the girl was killed horrifically.

Sahil stabbed Sakshi over 20 times and then bludgeoned her with a cement slab, which killed her on the spot. She was found to have 34 injury marks on her body and her skull smashed.

Sahil has claimed Sakshi was seen to get back with Praveen since he had a motorcycle, police said. On Saturday, Sakshi warned Sahil to stay away from her as she did not

want to continue her relationship with him. She was with her friend Bhawna and her boyfriend Jhabru at the time. Jhabru too threatened to beat Sahil if he came near Sakshi, police said.

The girl had broken up with Sahil eight day ago. Police also said Sakshi used the name her friend Neetu's husband, who is a known criminal of the area, to threaten Sahil.

According to police, Sakshi and Sahil had been going around since June 2021, however, for the last three to four months, as Sahil grew close to her, she started growing distant. On Sunday afternoon, Sahil got drunk and confronted Sakshi, who was on her way to the birthday party of her friend's kid after changing clothes in a public convenience, police said.

Woman kills flatmate for abusing her father

A 36-year-old woman was arrested for allegedly killing her flatmate early Tuesday morning for abusing her father who had died three months ago. According to police, Sapna, the accused, worked as a waitress or a decorator for parties.

She is divorced and has a daughter. The incident took place in Majnu Ka Tila in north Delhi's Civil Lines area, police said, adding they were informed about the incident around 7 am.

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday again hit out at the Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena and asked him to rein in the "collapsed" law and order in the city which has seen two cold



blooded murders this week alone. On reaching the spot, police found the body of 35-year-old Rani lying in a pool of blood with Sapna also there, a senior police officer said.

During interrogation, Sapna broke down and confessed to the crime, police said.

She told police that she and Rani lived in a rented flat in Majnu Ka Tila. Rani used to work at a beauty parlour in Gurgaon, a senior police offi-

cer said. On Monday night, Sapna and Rani along with a group of friends had a dinner party till around 1 am at their friend Neha's house in Aruna Nagar area of Majnu Ka Tila.

During the party, Sapna and Rani, who were both drunk, had a fight, he said.

After the party, they both returned to their flat and continued drinking.

Around 4.30 am, they

again had an altercation which turned into a scuffle during which Sapna stabbed Rani with a kitchen knife in her chest.

The trigger for the assault, Sapna told police, was Rani's abusing her dead father. Rani was rushed to a nearby hospital where she succumbed immediately, police said.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (North) Sagar Singh Kalsi said, "Teams of FSL and crime have inspected the spot. We have registered a case of murder under section 302 of the Indian Penal Code. Based on the investigation, the accused Sapna was arrested after she confessed to her crime."

Efforts are being taken to recover the weapon of offence." After the post mortem, Rani's body will be handed over to her family, police said.

Kejriwal urges LG to appoint retired judge as DERC chief

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has once again sent the name of Justice (ret'd) Rajiv Kumar Srivastava to the Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena for his appointment as the new chairperson of the power regulator Delhi Electricity Regulatory Commission (DERC). The move comes in the wake of the Supreme Court May 19 order that directed Lt Governor of Delhi to act on the aid and advice of the council of ministers and to appoint DERC chairperson within two weeks.

"Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has once again sent the file for the appointment of the DERC chairperson to the LG of Delhi. This action follows the stern reprimand issued by the Supreme Court of India on May 19, which directed the LG to fulfil the appointment within a two-week time frame," the government said. The appoint-



ment of the DERC chairperson is crucial to effectively regulate the electricity sector in Delhi. "The recent decisions handed down by the Supreme Court on May 11, 2023, in the Services Matter and May 19, 2023, in the DERC matter, reaffirmed the constitutional framework that requires the LG to act upon the 'aid and advice' of the state government, except in matters pertaining to land, law and order, and the police force," it said.

In January this year, the Delhi Chief Minister had approved appointment of Justice (ret'd) Srivastava as the



DERC chairperson.

"The appointment of the DERC Chairperson is crucial to effectively regulate the electricity sector in Delhi. Four months ago, the Kejriwal government approved the appointment of retired Justice Rajiv Kumar Srivastava as the DERC Chairperson."

The Delhi government had earlier filed a petition in the top court over the delay of the DERC chief's appointment. In the appointment of Justice (ret'd) Srivastava, Delhi government has referred to Section 84(2) of the Electricity Act, that requires consultation with the Chief Justice of the High Court of the appointee's original jurisdiction, the statement said.

On May 19, the Supreme Court ordered the Delhi Lieutenant Governor to make a decision on the matter within two weeks while hearing the case. The Supreme Court also stated that the LG of Delhi is obligated to work in cooperation and on the aid and advice of the elected government. In light of the Supreme Court's order, the Kejriwal government has once again sent the file to the LG, recommending the appointment of retired Justice Rajiv Kumar Srivastava as the DERC Chairperson.

The Delhi government had earlier filed a petition in the top court over the delay of the DERC chief's appointment. In the appointment of Justice (ret'd) Srivastava, Delhi government has referred to Section 84(2) of the Electricity Act, that requires consultation with the Chief Justice of the High Court of the appointee's original jurisdiction, the statement said.

Thunderstorm lashes Capital

A severe thunderstorm reaching speeds up to 80 kilometres per hour and rain hit Delhi on Tuesday evening, sending pedestrians running for cover and affecting vehicular movement. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) said another western disturbance is likely to bring storms and rain to the northern plains, including Delhi, over the next few days.

Maximum temperatures are predicted to remain below the 40-degree mark until June 5. The Safdarjung Observatory, Delhi's primary weather station, recorded a maximum temperature of 35.9 degrees Celsius, five notches below normal, on Tuesday.

Delhi experienced moderate to severe thunderstorms with lightning and gusty winds, reaching speeds of 70-80 kilometres per hour, the Met office said. As gusty winds blew across the city, many pedestrians rushed for shelter as it began to rain while vehicular movement



was also affected.

The IMD has issued a 'yellow' alert for Wednesday, warning of traffic disruptions and inundation of low-lying areas due to rain. The maximum temperature is expected to hover around 35 degrees Celsius.

This is the first time since 2014, the national Capital has not recorded any heatwave in May in the pre-monsoon season. A few isolated areas, however, witnessed heatwave conditions for a brief period in April and May.

May, historically the hottest month in Delhi with a mean maximum temperature of 39.5 degrees Celsius, has recorded

below-normal temperatures and excess rain this time.

Meteorologists attributed the phenomenon to higher-than-usual western disturbances — weather systems that originate in the Mediterranean region and bring unseasonal rainfall to northwest India — this pre-monsoon season (March to May).

"Usually, five to six western disturbances are recorded in the northern plains in April and May. We saw 10 western disturbances, mostly strong ones, this time," said Kuldeep Srivastava, head of the Regional Forecasting Centre of the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

Now, travel on Airport Line with WhatsApp ticketing service

Delhi Metro commuters will now be able to travel on the Airport Line using a WhatsApp-based ticketing service launched on Tuesday. The system allows commuters to receive a QR code-based ticket directly on WhatsApp.

"Further enhancing the travel experience for its commuters in an easy to navigate digital mode, Delhi Metro today introduced a WhatsApp-based ticketing service for travel on its Airport Express Line," the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) said.

The service was launched by DMRC Managing Director Vikas Kumar at the Metro Bhawan here in the presence of other senior officials.

With the introduction of this facility, commuters on the Airport Line will now be able to use WhatsApp chatbot-generated QR code-based tickets from their smartphones.

This facility will make commuting more efficient and seamless for commuters, especially national and international travellers heading to or coming from the airport, using the Airport Line, as they can now purchase and use tickets generated in their phone itself through a dedicated WhatsApp chatbot (available in English and Hindi language) as per their convenience, the DMRC said.

To initiate the service, commuters will have to add the DMRC's official WhatsApp number 9650855800 in their phone's contact list, it said. For single and group journeys, a maximum six QR code-based tickets can be generated for each passenger, the officials said.

The tickets will be valid till the end of the business day.

HC dismisses Sisodia's bail plea in excise scam

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday dismissed the bail plea of former deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia in the excise policy scam being probed by the CBI, saying he is an influential man and the allegations against him are "very serious" in nature. The court since Sisodia was at the "helm of affairs" when the alleged scam took place, he cannot say he had no role to play.

In its 43 pages judgement, Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma denied the relief to the AAP leader, who was arrested on February 26, saying he has held the post of the deputy chief minister with 18 portfolios and added the witnesses are mostly public servants and could be influenced.

"Presently also, the party of the applicant is in power. Therefore, it cannot be disputed that the applicant is a high



profile person and has potential to influence the witnesses. Therefore, the apprehension of the CBI that the applicant might tamper with or otherwise adversely influence the witnesses cannot be ignored. The applicant is also not entitled to parity in view of his unparalleled position," Justice Sharma said in a 43-page judgement.

Sisodia was arrested by the CBI on February 26. The high court said the allegations against him are very serious in nature. Citing the allegations against the AAP leader, it said, the excise policy was formed at the instance of the "South Group" with mala fide intention to give undue advantage to them.

"Such an act points towards the misconduct of the applicant, who was admittedly a public servant and holding

highest position. The statement of the concerned excise officers has been relied upon by the CBI," it said.

The gravity (of offence) and the allegations do not entitle the accused to be admitted to bail, it said, adding the court is clear about the fact that the excise policy has not been examined in the present proceedings nor the powers of the government to frame economic policies.

It said economic policies framed by the government also fall within their domain and courts have to be very slow in interfering with them.

"However, the court cannot interfere into the same, only if such policy decisions have been taken bona fide and in the interest of the public. But if such policy decisions or schemes are alleged to have been taken mala fide or have the taint of any corrupt practice then certainly such decisions are required to be enquired into by concerned investigating agencies and examined by the court," the high court said.

It also said the AAP leader failed the triple test required for grant of bail in the view of the seriousness of the allegations and his position.

Dalit boy thrashed, kidnapped for not voting for accused in Panchayat polls

A Dalit youth was allegedly brutally thrashed after being kidnapped by five men for not voting in favour of one of them in last year's panchayat elections in Rathiwas village, police said on Tuesday.

The victim was allegedly also threatened at gunpoint but was later rescued by his parents, who rushed him to a hospital, they said.

On Monday, police registered an FIR against the five accused at Bilaspur Police Station. All five have been absconding since the incident was reported late on Sunday night, and police is trying to nab them. SHO of Bilaspur Police Station Rahul Dev said.

In his complaint, the Dalit youth said two men from the village — Manish and Monu — approached him near the village's Hanuman Temple around 10 pm. They told him that Sanjit Rathi, who had contested to be the village sarpanch in Rathiwas, had called him to his house, according to the complaint. "I refused to go with them but they forcibly took me to Rathi's house, where Deepak and Kalia were also present," the victim said.

"Rathi and the others locked me inside a room and thrashed me with sticks. They also threatened to kill me and used casteist slurs," he said.

Later, pointing a pistol at the victim, Deepak asked why he did not vote for Rathi in the sarpanch election, according to the complaint. After the victim's parents reached Rathi's house, he was released, it said. "They allowed me to go with my parents who took me to a nearby hospital," the victim said.

For this training session, a makeshift helipad was prepared on the ground of Delhi Police Academy, Jharoda Kalan.

Nigerian gang dupes 20 women of crs through Insta

During police interrogation, the accused revealed that five people were involved in their gang. All of them used to target women through Instagram.

The gang has so far confessed to cheating on more than 20 women.

According to police, the victim was a local woman who reported the matter on April 10 at Manesar Police Station.

DU aims to increase Int'l students' intake

The Delhi University is aiming to increase the intake of international students in the upcoming academic cycle by 20 per cent from the previous year, with officials reaching out to diplomatic missions to invite more applications.

In 2022-23, a total of 637 foreign students were admitted across undergraduate, post-graduate, and PhD courses at the varsity, officials said. Till now, the university has received around 2,000 applications, including those from the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR).

Foreign nationals are admitted to various programmes of study at the University of Delhi under two categories — self-financing students and students with the Indian Council for Cultural Relations — under its various scholarship schemes. ICCR



administers various scholarship programmes annually and awards about 3,000 scholarships under 21 different schemes to foreign students from about 180 countries.

The Delhi University (DU) has taken various steps to increase the intake of ICCR applicants. The admission cycle for foreign students for the academic year 2023-24 has already begun.

"The application window is open. We have started working on clearing these applications. We are receiving hundreds of queries every day via phone and e-mail," Professor Amarjiva Lochan, Jt Dean, International Relations said.

City soon to have 1st lot of planned 1,500 electric buses: Min

Delhi Transport Minister Kailash Gahlot on Tuesday conducted an inspection of the ongoing construction work at Savda Ghevra, where a state-of-the-art fully electric bus depot is being built.

With an estimated cost of approximately ₹60 crore, the depot is set to accommodate the forthcoming fleet of electric buses in the national Capital.

"The construction expenses amount to nearly ₹30 crore and the electrification costs will be ₹30.11 crore. Equipped with charging facilities, this depot which is spread across 7.8 acres will have the capacity to park

200 electric buses, marking a significant step towards creating a modern, efficient, and sustainable public transportation system, the government said in a release.

During the inspection, Gahlot emphasised the urgency of expediting the construction work, underscoring the need for timely completion.

In a statement, he said "Delhi will soon have the first lot of the planned 1,500 electric buses in the city and all the buses are scheduled to arrive by end of this year. Three bus depots namely Rajghat, Mundela kalan and Rohini Sector 37 are already operational with Electric buses.

CPI(M) slams Centre's ordinance, backs city Govt on services matters

Accusing the Government of attacking federalism, CPI(M) general secretary Sitaram Yechury on Tuesday condemned the Central ordinance on control of administrative services in Delhi and extended his party's support to AAP in opposing it in Parliament when a bill will be brought to replace it. The development comes after Delhi Chief Minister and AAP convener Arvind Kejriwal met Yechury at the CPI(M) office, seeking the Left party's support on the issue.

Yechury appealed to the Congress and other opposition parties to support the Aam



Aadmi Party (AAP) on the issue, saying promulgation of the ordinance on administrative services in Delhi is a "brazen violation" of the Constitution and this can happen with the government of any non-BJP party.

He said the BJP government has been attacking the pillars of the Constitution — its federal structure — which he said was not only being "violated" but also destroyed. "Numerous attacks are happening on the rights of the

states and this is one brazen way by getting an ordinance. We protest against this and whenever we get a chance to vote against it, we will.

"I appeal to all political parties to come forward to protest against this ordinance. Parties which have not condemned it so far should understand that today it is the Delhi government, tomorrow it could be Kerala, Rajasthan and other places where there is Congress government or states with governments of regional parties. The Modi government can go to any extent to destabilise non-BJP government," Yechury said in a joint press briefing soon after the meeting with Kejriwal.

BJP welcomes HC's order, says former Deputy CM liable for action for graft

The BJP on Monday welcomed the denial of bail to former deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia saying the politician is "liable for action" against him for "corruption" in framing of the now-scrapped Delhi excise policy. Leader of Opposition in Delhi Assembly, Ramvir Singh Bidhuri said that the Delhi High Court denial of bail to Sisodia is a tight slap on the face of chief minister Arvind Kejriwal who has been giving clean chit to Sisodia. Bidhuri said Kejriwal should now apologize for the same.

Addressing a press conference, BJP leader and Union Minister Meenakshi Lekhi said: "There is a very famous proverb which says, fence eating the crop. This comes to my mind because there is a strong suspicion that those who are supposed to protect and uphold the law have become the violators of law... indulged in corruption and caused harm to the public exchequer." Referring to Sisodia, she said being a public servant he was liable to be probed by the CBI and ED for



"altering the policy to favour some people and some companies."

Lekhi read out the High Court's order on Sisodia's bail application as well certain portions of the supplementary charge sheet filed by the probe agency in the trial court. She said, "the charges of cartelisation and corruption have been furnished and supplemented... And, the pending action under the law by the CBI and ED is awaited. That's why bail application was rejected."

Bidhuri said that the dismissal of bail application is the clear indication that corruption took place through excise policy.

Bidhuri said that the comments made by the court while rejecting the bail plea of Manish Sisodia should open the eyes of the AAP leaders.

'US accorded depth of friendship, strategic partnership to India'

The US has accorded a "depth" of friendship and strategic partnership to India that is unmatched in the world and it is set to expand further during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Washington next month, US Ambassador Eric Garcetti said on Tuesday.



In an interview to PTI, Garcetti suggested that the two countries are working on certain agreements to bolster defence cooperation and they are likely to be signed up when Modi visits the US or President Joe Biden comes to India in September for the G20 summit.

On challenges being faced by India from China along its land border as well as in the maritime domain, he said New Delhi can depend on Washington as it stands for respecting borders, sovereignty and the rule of law.

"We will protect and defend these principles. If one country thinks that it can unilaterally change the status quo, that is unacceptable to all of us. We also want to deter action. We would like to see a more peaceful relationship with China for both India and the United States," he said.

At the same time, Garcetti asserted that "bullying" by anybody would not be acceptable.

He said India-US partnership has assumed greater significance for the world in the context of the current geopolitical situation, asserting that the partnership is not only beneficial for the two countries but also for the globe.

India, Cambodia discuss capacity-building, defence

India and Cambodia on Tuesday reviewed the entire spectrum of their ties during talks here between Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar and Cambodian King Norodom Sihamoni. They also held discussions on key areas like capacity building, defence and parliamentary cooperation here, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said.

Earlier in the day, King Sihamoni was accorded a ceremonial welcome by President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan. Prime Minister Narendra Modi was also present to greet the King at the forecourts of Rashtrapati Bhavan.

Modi later tweeted, saying, "Delighted to welcome King HM Norodom Sihamoni of Cambodia. Our nations share deep historical and cultural ties, and we look forward to strengthening our friendship and cooperation even further. May his visit mark a new chapter in India-Cambodia relations."

In a tweet, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said he was honoured to call on King Sihamoni. "His visit, as our two countries celebrate 70th anniversary of our diplomatic relations, reaffirms the strong civilisational bond between us. Today that is expressed in cooperation in heritage conservation, demining, water conservation and socio-economic projects."

Discussions between Dhankhar and the Cambodian King "covered multiple areas of bilateral relations, including capacity building, conservation of architectural monuments, defence cooperation, including de-mining, parliamentary cooperation," MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said. In a separate tweet, the Vice President Secretariat said Dhankhar recalled the warm welcome and good discussions during his visit to Cambodia for India-ASEAN and East Asia Summits in 2022.

"They had wide-ranging discussions on bilateral relations and other issues of mutual interest," it said.

The visiting dignitary on Tuesday morning paid tributes to Mahatma Gandhi at Raj Ghat. The Cambodian King arrived here on Monday on a maiden state visit. He is accompanied by a 27-member high-level delegation, including the minister of the royal palace, minister of foreign affairs and other senior officials.

The state visit marks the culmination of the celebrations of the 70th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and Cambodia.

India to host SCO annual meet virtually

India will host the annual summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) in the virtual format on July 4. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) announced this on Tuesday but it did not cite reasons for holding the summit in virtual mode.

Last year, the in-person SCO summit took place in the Uzbek city of Samarkand that was attended by all top leaders of the grouping including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Russian President Vladimir Putin and his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping.

India assumed the rotating chairmanship of the SCO at the Samarkand Summit on September 16 last year.

"Under India's first-ever chairmanship, the 22nd sum-

mit of the SCO Council of Heads of State will be held in the virtual format on July 4, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi," the MEA said in a statement. India hosted the foreign ministers of the SCO at a two-day conclave in Goa earlier this month. All the SCO member states — China, Russia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan — have been invited to attend the summit, the MEA said.

"In addition, Iran, Belarus and Mongolia have been invited as observer states. As per SCO tradition, Turkmenistan has also been invited as the guest of the chair," it said.

The SCO is an influential economic and security bloc and has emerged as one of the largest trans-regional international organisations.

India major player in world, says UN peacekeeping chief

"India is a major player in the world, in the UN, in multilateralism, and it's a major player in peacekeeping as well, including but not only through the importance of its contribution in terms of troops and police. We're also supported in many other ways, including in terms of the initiatives that we take to improve peacekeeping," Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations Jean-Pierre Lacroix told PTI in an exclusive interview.

The UN peacekeeping chief highlighted the "important role" played by peacekeepers from India, one of the significant troop and police-contributing countries to UN peacekeeping.

Lacroix said India's "engagement and commitment" in support of peace operations is critical, both politically through its contribution and in support of the department's initiatives.

He further underlined the "role of India in supporting our initiative to make sure that peace operations will be up to speed in terms of digital technologies because this is absolutely critical. We have a strategy for the digital transformation of peacekeeping."

The UN marked 75 years of peacekeeping and commemorated the International Day of UN Peacekeepers on May 29 with this year's theme of "Peace begins with me."

Three Indian peacekeepers, who lost their lives serving under the UN flag last year, were honoured posthumously with the prestigious Dag Hammarskjöld Medal at a solemn ceremony last week.

ED raids 12 places in probe against J'khand MLA case

The Enforcement Directorate on Tuesday conducted searches at various locations in Jharkhand linked to Congress MLA Pradeep Yadav and others as part of a money laundering probe.

The five-term legislator from the Poraiyahat seat of the State is presently the deputy leader of the party in the State Assembly. Sources said about a dozen locations linked to the MLA in the State were searched as part of a probe being conducted against him and others under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

In 2022, the Income Tax Department had searched the premises of Yadav, and another party legislator as part of a tax evasion probe against some business groups engaged in coal trading and other illegal trading activities in Jharkhand.

Ludhiana court blast case: Supplementary chargesheet filed

The NIA has filed a supplementary chargesheet against two persons in the Ludhiana court complex bomb blast case, in which one person was killed and six others injured on December 23, 2021.

One of the chargesheeted accused, Lakhbir Singh alias Rode of Moga district of Punjab, is reportedly in Pakistan from where he had smuggled IEDs into India for triggering explosions across Punjab. He is Chief of banned outfits, Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF) and International Sikh Youth Federation (ISFY).

The other accused chargesheeted in the case on Tuesday, Harpreet Singh alias Happy Malaysia of Amritsar district, was arrested in December 2022 from the Indian Gandhi International Airport (IGIA), Delhi.

One can't malign judicial officers by using social media, says SC

One cannot malign judicial officers by using Social Media, the Supreme Court observed on Tuesday while dismissing a plea challenging a Madhya Pradesh High Court order that sentenced a man to 10 days in jail for making corruption allegations against a District Judge. A travesti and Justice Prashant Kumar Mishra said it was not inclined to interfere in the matter.

"Just because you don't get a favourable order doesn't mean that you will malign the judicial officer. Independence

of (the) judiciary doesn't just mean independence from (the) executive but also from outside forces. This has to be a lesson for others also.

"He should have thought twice before casting any aspersions on the judicial officer. He maligning the judicial officer. Think of the damage done to the judicial officer's image," Justice Trivedi observed orally. The apex court was hearing a plea filed by Krishna Kumar Raghuvanshi, challenging the High Court judgment in a suo motu criminal contempt case initiated against him for making allegations of corruption against a District Judge.

Manipur athletes vow to return their awards

Say territorial integrity of State cannot be compromised

International and national award-winning sports persons from Manipur Tuesday said that they will return the prizes given to them by the government if the state's territorial integrity is compromised.

Eleven of them will submit a memorandum to Union Home Minister Amit Shah on the issue during his ongoing tour of the state.

L Anita Chanu (Dhyan Chand awardee), Arjuna awardee N Kunjarani Devi (Padma Shri), L Sarita Devi and W Sandhyarani Devi (Padma Shri awardee) and S Mirabai Chanu (Padma Shri and Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna awardee) are among the 11 sports persons. "If Amit Shah does not give us an assurance about the protection of the integrity of Manipur, we will

return our awards given by the Indian government," Anita Chanu said at a press conference here.

If the demand is not met, then the sports persons will not represent India in the future nor will they train any budding talent, she added.

The 11 sports persons went to submit a memorandum to Shah addressed to Prime Minister Narendra Modi but could not do so as the union home minister had left for Churachandpur to meet Kuki victims and organisations.

"We have submitted a copy of the memorandum to Chief Minister N Biren Singh. He has assured us of arranging a meeting with Shah in the evening after his return from Churachandpur. We will handover the memorandum to him then," Chanu said.

Man killed in Anantnag leaves behind wife, baby

Deepu Kumar, an expectant father, working in a temporary amusement park set up by a private player in Janglat Mandi area of South Kashmir's Anantnag district, was killed in cold blood by the two motor-cycle borne terrorists minutes after he stepped out to get some milk and bottled water before breaking bread with his wife late Monday night.

He leaves behind his pregnant wife, ageing parents, an elder brother with impaired eyesight and his family of four members including two children.

The Lieutenant Governor, Manoj Sinha has approved an ex-gratia of Rs. 5 lakh for the next of kin of Deepu.

A little-known outfit, Kashmir Freedom Fighter, believed to be a shadow outfit of the banned Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba, has claimed responsibility for the killing.

Sharing her last interaction with her husband, Sakshi, who travelled in an ambulance along with her husband's dead body, told reporters in village Thial, "after bringing food Deepak stepped out to get some milk and water. While he was returning I heard sounds of gunshots. I rushed out and saw he was lying there with his face towards the ground. Weeping inconsolably, she said, "We shifted him to the hospital but he succumbed". Sakshi could not respond to a few more questions raised by the reporters to piece together the sequence preceding his killing near their camping site.



Confident Congress

The party hopes to reconcile the differences between Gehlot and Pilot

Victory, John F Kennedy said, has a thousand fathers. All of them nourish it further, making it grow strong, resilient and confident. The landslide mandate that the Congress received in the recently-concluded Assembly election in Karnataka seems to have galvanised the grand old party in more than one way. It has certainly broken the toxic mix of sloth and inertia on fratricide in Rajasthan. On Monday, the high command summoned Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and his political rival and former deputy Sachin Pilot to Delhi. The duo had four-hour-long discussions with Rahul Gandhi and party president Mallikarjun Kharge. "Both leaders have unanimously decided to work together and left the decision on the high command," senior party leader KC Venugopal reportedly said after the meeting without divulging any details. On the face of it, this was an anodyne statement, but GOP leaders must have heaved a sigh of relief that the two desert warriors sat together after a long time. This is important as the Assembly election in Rajasthan is due later this year, especially as the State is known for changing government every five years. As it is, the no-holds-barred fight between Gehlot and Pilot has hurt the party's image in the State. Some time ago, the party may have feared a repeat of Rajasthan in Karnataka. Now, having reconciled the differences between Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and State party chief DK Shivakumar, the GOP would like to do a Karnataka in Rajasthan.



It may not be easy, though, for the Congress. The fight between Gehlot and Pilot was quite intense in which many red lines were crossed. Gehlot had made several uncharitable remarks about Pilot. Pilot, on his part, had been denouncing the Gehlot Government over inaction on alleged corruption during the previous BJP government under Vasundhara Raje. The big question is: would Gehlot and Pilot be willing to bury the hatchet? It is not just the GOP leadership but the entire Opposition would like them to, for if that happens, not only the Congress would be in a stronger position to take on the Bharatiya Janata Party in the forthcoming State polls but also in the 2024 general election. Further, as an upshot, the entire Opposition would gain strength. Many Opposition leaders are trying to forge an alliance against the Bharatiya Janata Party. Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar will be holding a meeting in Patna in a few days; Nationalist Congress Party leader Sharad Pawar is working towards that end. All these attempts, along with the Congress' newfound confidence, can make arithmetic favourable for the Opposition, but that may not be enough. As we mentioned earlier, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is not the BJP's solitary trump card; the saffron party has also been able to entrench its narrative in political debate—the narrative of muscular nationalism, Hindutva, and unprecedented infrastructure development. The Opposition doesn't have a viable alternative to that.

Indo-Nepal ties will flourish on trust

Political engagement between the countries is missing for some time now. The historicity of bilateral relations will depend on Prachanda's longevity as PM

PM Pushpa Kamal Dahal Prachanda will finally arrive today on a four days visit. Prachanda's first visit was a state visit when he came after the 10 April 2008 Constituent Assembly elections to 575 elected seats (out of 601) after the monarchy was dismantled and Nepal declared a federal democratic, secular republic. Prachanda who won peace after ten years of civil war, became Nepal's charismatic leader and beloved hero, his party winning 227 seats more than Nepali Congress (110) and CPN UML (103) combined.

It was a rude shock for India which had put its money on Nepali Congress. Still, it tried to adjust to Maoist ways to give Prachanda a grand welcome with the expectation that he would be sensitive to India's concerns and national interests. That hope was belied as Prachanda had ideas of a People's Republic chasing which he was forced to resign. The rest is a legend. In the second CA elections in November 2013, Maoists won 81 seats. Prachanda's second visit was in 2016-17 when he switched to NC from UML for power-sharing with NC PM Sher Bahadur Deuba. After the 2017 elections, Maoists won 53 seats and were forced to join the Left alliance which won a nearly two-thirds majority but Prachanda's hopes of becoming Prime Minister in a power-sharing deal with PM KP Oli never materialised.

In November 2022 elections his party slumped to 32 seats but all through the electoral cycles, CPN (Maoist Centre) even with declining numbers, remained the number 3 party – the kingmakers – with NC and UML alternating as the single largest party. Prachanda's reduced strength and power had not dimmed his ambition to be the prime minister. He demonstrated political dexterity in switching coalitions earlier this year to remain PM. Nepal's mixed electoral system makes a single-party majority unlikely. People

frustrated with the non-performance of older parties, voted TV anchor, Rabi Lamichhane, as leader of the fourth largest Rashtriya Swatantra Party (22



seats) and the rapper Balen Shah, Mayor of Kathmandu humbling NC, UML and Maoists.

The three by-polls held in April in which RSP won two seats with overwhelming numbers including one from an NC stronghold have rung alarm bells for all political parties. Prachanda wants to revive the fortune of Maoists with India's help. That is why Prachanda wants to make his present visit historic and a game changer in India-Nepal relations for which he has to win back India's trust and most of all, the trust of the people of Nepal. He is now part of the eight-party coalition led by NC, along with CPN (Unified Socialist), Janata Samajwadi Party, Loktantrik Samajwadi Party, Janmat Party, Nagarik Unmukti Party and Rashtriya Jan Morcha. It is a different Prachanda who as Prime Minister leads the coalition and his party. He has to undo the pro-China image that he shed long ago that went unnoticed by New Delhi's political elite. This will not be easy in a Left-Right coalition.

Prachanda has to remould his party with a makeover of leadership. India should be impressed that Prachanda unlike in 2008 when he went to China first, has this time declined Beijing's invitation for the Boao Forum in March and declared his intention to

visit India first despite the scheduling and cabinet formation difficulties. New Delhi has not sent the right signals by failing to give an earlier date for his visit. It would have added to the credibility and stability of the coalition government. During the last Prime Ministerial visit of Mr Deuba last year, no major agreements were signed. Wait, watch and act after the November 2022 elections were India's policy. Mr Dahal has proved his nimbleness by securing three votes of confidence, signing two Common Minimum Programmes and getting the budget passed last Monday. He is also seen to be acting against corruption.

One of the key expectations of Nepal is a more fair and liberal power trade agreement. At a power summit held in Kathmandu in April, Nepalese power traders complained that India had not provided full access to power markets as per the MoU of 2014. New Delhi has so far permitted the sale of 452.6 MW whereas Kathmandu wants to sell 1000MW of power. There are other restrictions to the sale of power especially from projects with any connection with Chinese companies or Chinese contractors. Besides trade with India, it wants to diversify – sell to Bangladesh also. Connectivity

is the other big expectation.

The DPR of the 136 km Raxaul-Kathmandu railway project spurred by an earlier Chinese proposal of a Railway from Kirung to Kathmandu has to be progressed. It is estimated to cost USD 2.5bn for which Nepal wants a grant. Nepal is also interested in India setting up a fertilizer plant and/or a pipeline similar to the petroleum pipeline from Birgunj to Amlekhgunj. The Pokhara international airport built by the Chinese with a China Eximbank loan remains confined to domestic use because of Indian reservations. Another issue that may come up is Agniveer due to which Gorkha's recruitment from Nepal is in suspended animation. Overall 12 MOUs are to be signed which is historic.

Political engagement between leaders missing for some time now requires restoration. The historicity of bilateral relations will depend on the stability of the coalition and Prachanda's longevity as PM. In some ways they are interdependent.

Innovative ways to beat the smoking urge

Owing to increasing consumption of tobacco across the world, the WHO dedicated May 31 to commemorate 'World No-Tobacco Day' in 1987

Consumption of tobacco is injurious to health. Everyone around is aware of this fact, however, for the majority of tobacco users, the allure of tobacco and the cravings it evokes can be overpowering.

Owing to the increasing consumption of tobacco among individuals worldwide, WHO dedicated 31st May to commemorate World No-Tobacco Day every year since 1987. and lozenges, or prescription of non-nicotine cessation medications like bupropion (Wellbutrin SR, Wellbutrin XL, etc) and varenicline. These swift-acting treatments are generally safe to use alongside long-acting nicotine patches or non-nicotine cessation medications.

● **Steer Clear of Triggers** – One must be aware of the triggers that prompt one to smoke. It is most likely that the potency of tobacco urges gets most pronounced in settings where one habitually smokes or chews tobacco. For instance, parties, bars, moments of stress, or while savouring a cup of coffee are likely scenarios. Identify your triggers and devise a plan to avoid them.

● **Social networking:** The formation of social networks by persons who

have successfully quit smoking, and their motivation for persons in the process of quitting may help psychologically.

● **Employ the Power of Delay-** When struck by tobacco craving, challenge yourself to postpone its enchantment by an additional 10 minutes. During this time, engage in activities that successfully divert your attention. Consider venturing into a smoke-free zone within your vicinity. Employing these simple but effective tactics might be sufficient to surmount the craving.

● **Channel Your Chewing Impulses-** Offer your mouth an alternative activity to ward off tobacco cravings. Chew on sugarless gum or relish a piece of hard candy or else savour the crunch of raw carrots, nuts, or sunflower seeds for distraction.

● **Beware of the Illusion of "Just One"**- The allure of succumbing to the illusion of satisfying a smoking craving with a single cigarette is compelling. However, do not deceive yourself into believing that

stopping at one will suffice. More often than not, indulging in a solitary cigarette will lead to another.

● **Harness the Power of Physical Activity-** Physical exertion possesses the capacity to divert your attention away from tobacco or smoking cravings. Even brief bursts of activity, such as ascending and descending stairs several times, can successfully reduce the craving, or a brisk walk or jog. Quitting smoking is one of the best things you can do for your health with these innovative ways depending on the individual's preferences. Some people find success with nicotine replacement therapy, while others prefer to quit cold turkey. Several support groups can aid avid smokers in quitting. No matter which method you choose, it is important to be patient and persistent because quitting smoking is not easy; however, it is certainly worth it, for your health. Mindfulness can be practised by anyone irrespective of any faith or religion



Children with disabilities need robust policies for support

The National Family Health Survey must include specific questions about disabilities to help formulate appropriate policy

India has 2.68 crore persons with a disability, according to the 2011 Census. However, with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, of 2016, now recognizing 21 types of disabilities, this number is expected to increase manifold. A robust policy is critical to encompass their aspirations and ensure all persons with disability achieve their full potential and play an active part in nation-building.

This is why the recent decision to drop questions related to disability from the sixth National Family Health Survey (NFHS), scheduled to begin on July 1, 2023, is inexplicable. The NFHS, conducted every three years, collects data on a gamut of development indices vital to inform policy and programmes.

This survey, which covers approximately seven lakh households across the country, is an important tool to gather data on whether people with disabilities have access to basic amenities and other government programmes.

However, at a time when the need to ensure no one gets left behind is doubly important considering the ravages caused by Covid, the exclusion of questions on disability is an opportunity lost to gather disaggregated disability data.

An Opportunity Lost

According to the Disability Rights India Foundation (DRIF), a non-profit working for disability rights, disability disaggregated data is the cornerstone for disability-relevant services. Instead of sharp-

ening its questionnaire related to disability, NFHS has reversed the process by removing disability-related questions altogether.

Considering that India is a signatory to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), this regressive move contradicts its principle of "leaving no one behind" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. In India, PwDs experience an average loss of 10-17 years in life expectancy. Creating pathways to change this and make health services disability inclusive requires access to comprehensive health data which NFHS could have provided.

Children with disabilities are disadvantaged on most

measures of child well-being. In comparison to children without disabilities, children with disabilities are 24% less likely to receive early stimulation and responsive care; 42% less likely to have foundational reading and numeracy skills; 25% more likely to be wasted and 34% more likely to be stunted; 53% more likely to have symptoms of acute respiratory infection; 49% more likely to have never attended school; 32% more likely to face corporal punishment; 47% more likely to be out of primary school, 33% more likely to be out of lower secondary school and 27% more likely to be out of upper secondary school; 51% more likely to feel unhappy and 41% likely to feel more discriminated against.

Now consider the fact that

one-third of disabilities in children are preventable if detected early and empowered with timely interventions. A roadmap based on accurate data to reach about 20.42 lakh children in the 0-9 age group with some form of disabilities, either congenital or acquired, could be life-changing.

It is no secret that existing disparities were exacerbated by Covid. In the context of education, data shows that before the pandemic, more than 4.1 million girls were not going to school across India. The closure of 1.5 million schools during the pandemic impacted over 247 million children enrolled in elementary and secondary schools, including 37 million with disabilities.

A 2020 survey by Swabhimana, a community-

based organization working for the rights of persons with disability, in Odisha, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Tripura, Chennai, Sikkim, Nagaland, Haryana and J&K found about 43% of children with disabilities planned to drop out due to hardships in online education.

It is not just the lack of access to educational aids that impedes the well-being of a PwD. They have little or no access to health services as information about disease symptoms and prevention, is not provided in accessible formats such as print materials in Braille, sign language interpretation, captions, audio provisions and graphics.

Women with disabilities are doubly marginalised on account of their disability and

their gender and face greater social barriers, discrimination and isolation. Moreover, women and girls with disabilities are three times more likely to experience gender-based violence compared to non-disabled women.

The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, emphasises prevention of disability through appropriate awareness measures, investigation, and research. Article 31 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities mandates collection of appropriate information on PwDs to enable the formulation and implementation of policies. Can there be a better mechanism than the NFHS to gather data to understand the prevalence and pattern of disabilities?

Khan appears before anti-terrorism court

Pakistan's former prime minister Imran Khan on Tuesday appeared before an anti-terrorism court in four cases, including the attack on Lahore Corp Commander House, and submitted surety bonds in connection with his pre-arrest bail till June 2.

"Khan appeared before the ATC Lahore judge Ijaz Ahmad Buttar and submitted surety bonds worth PKR 100,000 each in the four terrorism cases in which he had already been given pre-arrest bail till June 2," a court official told PTI.

As the 70-year-old chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party appeared in the court amid high security, a group of lawyers chanted slogans in his favour.

Khan's counsel also challenged the search warrants of the former premier's Zaman Park Lahore residence in the anti-terrorism court. The judge summoned the Punjab



police DIG (operations) for next hearing and directed him to submit a reply.

On May 9, violent protests erupted after the arrest of Khan by paramilitary Rangers in Islamabad. His party workers vandalised over 20 military installations and government buildings, including the Lahore Corps Commander House, Mianwali airbase and the ISI building in Faisalabad.

The Army headquarters (GHQ) in Rawalpindi was also attacked by the mob for the first time. Khan was later released on bail.

Law enforcement agencies have arrested over 10,000 workers of Khan's Pakistan party across Pakistan, 4,000 of them from Punjab. Police put the death toll in violent clashes to 10 while Khan's party claims 40 of its workers lost their lives in the firing by security personnel.

Meanwhile, two lawyers of Khan appeared before a joint investigation team probing

Sharif: Anarchists don't qualify for dialogue

Islamabad (PTI): Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday hinted that his government was unwilling to talk with Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party, saying the "anarchists and arsonists" who wear the garb of politicians and attack the symbols of the state do not

qualify for a dialogue. Khan, 70, who was ousted via a vote of no confidence in April last year, said he is ready to speak to "anyone who is in power" after his party's top leaders began to quit the party following the May 9 riots in which sensitive military installations were attacked.

The joint investigation team - formed by the Punjab interim government to probe arson attacks on Jinnah House and the Askari Corporate Tower in Lahore on May 9 - had summoned Khan for Tuesday to record his statement but he sent his lawyers instead.

The attack on Corps Commander House known as Jinnah House in Lahore.

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JIT summons ex-Pak PM

Lahore (PTI): A joint investigation team probing the violent attack on the historic Corps Commander House or the Jinnah House here on May 9 has summoned former Pakistan prime minister Imran Khan on Tuesday. Khan, the chief of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party, has been asked to appear before the JIT at 4 pm at the Qilla Gujjar police headquarters in Lahore. He has been called for questioning in a case registered with the Sarwar Road police station against the attack.

Jinnah House (Corps Commander House) was torched by arsonists following the anti-government protests against the arrest of Khan on May 9. A large number of PTI party workers May 9 stormed the Jinnah House and set it on fire after vandalising it.

No meeting between US, Chinese defence chiefs, says Beijing

Prospects for a renewed high-level military dialogue between China and the US remain dim, with Beijing saying their defense chiefs will not hold a bilateral meeting while both are attending a weekend security conference in Singapore.

Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning on Tuesday blamed the US, saying Washington should "earnestly respect China's sovereignty and security interests and concerns, immediately correct the wrongdoing, show sincerity, and create the necessary atmosphere and conditions for dialogue and communication between the two militaries." Mao gave no details, but tensions between the sides have spiked over Washington's military support and sales of defensive weapons to self-governing Taiwan, China's assertions of sovereignty to the contested South China Sea and its flying of a suspected spy balloon over the US.

US Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin is scheduled to address the Shangri-La Dialogue on Saturday, while Chinese Defense Minister Gen. Li Shangfu will speak at the gathering on Sunday.

Austin met privately with Li's predecessor, Wei Fenghe, at last year's Shangri-La Dialogue, which appeared to do little to smooth relations between the sides.

In his address to the forum, Wei accused the US of seeking to contain China's development and threatening to assert its claim to Taiwan by military force.

Chinese leader Xi Jinping and US President Joe Biden met on the sidelines of the Group of 20 meeting of large economies in November in Indonesia, but contacts have proceeded only sporadically since then, with only side meetings on neutral territory.

Secretary of State Antony Blinken canceled a visit to Beijing in February after the US shot down a Chinese spy balloon that had crossed the United States.

He later met with the Communist Party's senior foreign affairs adviser Wang Yi in Austria.

China refused to take a phone call from Austin to discuss the balloon issue, the Pentagon said.

China launches first spaceship with civilian

Beijing/Jiuquan (PTI): China on Tuesday successfully launched the Shenzhou-16 manned spaceship, sending three astronauts, including the first civilian to its space station combination for a five-month mission.

The spaceship, atop a Long March-2F carrier rocket, blasted off from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre in northwest China at 9:31 AM (Beijing Time), according to the China Manned



Space Agency (CMSA).

About 10 minutes after the launch, Shenzhou-16 separated from the rocket and entered its designated orbit. The crew members are in good shape and the launch is a complete success, the CMSA declared, it said. The astronauts are expected to dock with the station's Tianhe core module about 400km above the ground - after a journey of less than seven hours.

For the first time, China has included a civilian in its rotating crew for the space station which otherwise remained a domain of the military personnel. Gui Haichao, a professor at Beihang University in Beijing regarded as a payload specialist was among the three astronauts.

The other two are mission commander Jing Haipeng, who is also making history by becoming the first Chinese astronaut to go into space for a record fourth time.

The astronaut flight engineer Zhu Yangzhu is also making his first journey into space.

The Shenzhou-16 will be the first crew mission after China's space station programme entered the stage of application and development, Lin Xiqiang, deputy director of the CMSA told the media on Monday. The trio will stay in orbit for about five months, he said.

Once ready, China will be the only country to own a space station as the International Space Station (ISS) of Russia is a collaborative project of several countries. The ISS station is also set to be decommissioned by 2030.

The significant feature of China's space station is its two robotic arms, especially the long one which has the ability to grab objects, including satellites from space. After entering orbit, the Shenzhou-16 spaceship will make a fast, automated rendezvous and docking with the space station combination.

Musk meets Chinese FM

Beijing: China's foreign minister met Tesla Ltd. CEO Elon Musk on Tuesday and said strained US-Chinese relations require "mutual respect", while delivering a message of reassurance that foreign companies are welcome.

US-Chinese relations are especially tense after Washington shot down a Chinese balloon believed to be gathering intelligence and warned Beijing against supplying arms to Russia for its war against Ukraine. The Wall Street Journal reported China has rejected a request for its defense minister to meet the U.S. defense secretary when both are in Singapore this weekend.

"We need to keep the steering wheel in the right direction of mutual respect, peaceful coexistence and win-win cooperation," Qin Gang told Musk, according to a ministry statement. The two sides should "avoid dangerous driving," Qin said. He gave no details of steps to improve relations. AP

Russia: Moscow buildings lightly damaged, while Kyiv bombarded

AP ■ KYIV

A rare drone attack jolted Moscow early Tuesday, causing only light damage but forcing evacuations as residential buildings were struck in the Russian capital for the first time in the war against Ukraine.

The Kremlin, meanwhile, pursued its relentless bombardment of Kyiv with a third assault on the city in 24 hours.

The Russian Defence Ministry said five drones were shot down in Moscow and the systems of three others were jammed, causing them to veer off course.

President Vladimir Putin called it a "terrorist" act by Kyiv. The attack, causing only what Moscow Mayor Sergei Sobyanin called "insignificant damage" to several buildings, brought the war home to civilians in Russia's capital.

Two people received treat-

ment for unspecified injuries but did not need hospitalisation, he said in a Telegram post, adding that residents of two high-rise buildings damaged in the attack were evacuated.

Andrei Vorobyov, governor of the wider Moscow region, said some of the drones were "shot down on the approach to Moscow."

Ukraine made no direct comment on the attack, which would be one of its deepest and most daring strikes into Russia since the Kremlin launched its full-scale invasion of Ukraine more than 15 months ago.

Putin said Moscow's air defense "worked in a satisfactory way," but added it is "clear that our task is to plug the gaps" in the system.

"The Kyiv regime ... attempts to intimidate Russian citizens and strikes at civilian buildings," he said at a public event, responding to a question from the head of a Kremlin-allied think tank.

"It is, of course, a clear indication of terrorist activity," Asked by The Associated Press whether there is high-level concern that the invasion of Ukraine is endangering Russian civilians, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said only that attacks on Russia reinforce the need to prosecute the war.

Russian political analyst Tatiana Stanovaya, a senior fellow at the Carnegie Russia Eurasia Center, said the Kremlin's policy is to play down the attacks.

"You ask, why is Putin behaving like this, does he really not understand and fear the consequences?" she wrote in a Telegram post.

University of Edinburgh ties up with Indian Consulate for Hindi course

London (PTI): The University of Edinburgh's Climate Change Institute has announced its first open access course in Hindi developed through a partnership with the Consulate General of India in Edinburgh, Scotland.

The Climate Solutions course is available in English, Arabic and Hindi, with versions focused on Egypt, the UAE, India and the UK.

It is designed and delivered by award-winning climate change experts, including Executive Director of the Edinburgh Climate Change Institute (ECCI) Professor Dave Reid, the university said.

"It has been a real pleasure working in partnership with the India Consulate - with whom we have an excellent link - to develop this new open access climate change course," said Professor Reid.

"Huge thanks to the online course development team here at Edinburgh, and to the wonderful translation work led by our colleagues in the India Consulate, in bringing this important new course to life," he said.

9 hurt in shooting near beach in Hollywood

Hollywood (US): Nine people were injured Monday evening when gunfire erupted along a beach boardwalk in Hollywood, Florida, sending people frantically running for cover along the crowded beach on Memorial Day.

Several of the victims were taken to a children's hospital, police spokesperson Deanna Bettineschi said. However, authorities have not yet released the ages of the victims.

The nine victims included six adults and three children, according to Yanet Obarrio Sanchez, a spokesperson for Memorial Healthcare System. All of the victims were in stable condition, she said.

A preliminary investigation shows that an altercation between two groups resulted in gunfire, police said. One per-

son has been detained and another suspect is being still being sought.

The shooting happened about 6:30 p.m. on the boardwalk near a convenience store, a Ben & Jerry's ice cream store and a Subway sandwich shop. Alvie Carlton Scott III said he was on the beach when all of a sudden he heard numerous gunshots go off. He said he hid behind a tree and then fled the area after a police officer told people to run.

Jamie Ward, who was also on the boardwalk, said several young men were fighting in front of the stores when one pulled a gun and started shooting. Videos posted on Twitter on Monday evening showed emergency medical crews responding and providing aid to multiple injured people.

'Security treaty with Aus delayed over certain provisions'

Canberra (AP): Papua New Guinean Prime Minister James Marape said a proposed security treaty with Australia has been delayed over "certain wordings and provisions," a week after the strategically important South Pacific Island nation signed a new security pact with the United States that sparked protests.

Marape informed Australian Deputy Prime Minister Richard Marles of the delay on Monday on the sidelines of an international forum in South Korea, the Papua New Guinean leader's office said in a statement Tuesday.

Marape told Marles, who is also defense minister, that the treaty is a "work in progress and required the PNG side to consult our domestic processes and sovereign laws in relation to certain wordings and provisions," the statement said.

Marape "conveyed his apologies" to Prime Minister Anthony Albanese for the delay, the statement said.

Crucial days ahead as debt ceiling deal goes for vote

Biden calls lawmakers for support

AP ■ WASHINGTON

President Joe Biden says he "feels good" about the debt ceiling and budget deal negotiated with House Speaker Kevin McCarthy as the White House and congressional leaders work to ensure its passage this week in time to lift the nation's borrowing limit and prevent a disastrous US default. Biden spent part of the Memorial Day holiday working the phones, calling lawmakers in both parties, as the president does his part to deliver the votes.

A number of hard right conservatives are criticising the deal as falling short of the deep spending cuts they want-

ed, while liberals decry policy changes such as new work requirements for older Americans in the food aid programme.

A key test will come Tuesday afternoon when the House Rules Committee is scheduled to consider the package and vote on sending it to the full House for a vote expected Wednesday. "I feel very good about it," Biden told reporters Monday as he left Washington for his home in Delaware.

"I've spoken to a number of the members," he said, among them Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell, a past partner in big bipartisan deals who largely sat this one out.

"I spoke to a whole bunch of people, and it feels good," Biden said. To those progressive Democrats raising concerns about the package, the president had a simple message: "Talk to me."

As lawmakers size up the 99-page bill, few are expected

to be fully satisfied with the final product.

But Biden, a Democrat, and McCarthy, a Republican, are counting on pulling majority support from the political centre, a rarity in divided Washington, to join in voting to prevent a catastrophic federal default. Wall Street will open early Tuesday morning delivering its own assessment, as the US financial markets that had been closed when the deal was struck over the weekend show their reaction to the outcome.

McCarthy acknowledged the hard-fought compromise with Biden will not be "100% of what everybody wants" as he leads a slim House majority powered by hard-right conservatives. Facing potential blowback from his conservative ranks, the Republican speaker will have to rely on upwards of half the House Democrats and half the House Republicans to push the debt ceiling package to passage.

'UN watchdog closes two lines of inquiry on N-programme'

Tehran (AP): Iran's state-run news agency claimed Tuesday that international inspectors had closed off two lines of inquiry they had over Tehran's nuclear programme ahead of a scheduled quarterly report by the United Nations' nuclear watchdog.

The Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency, however, did not respond to questions over the report published by Iran's state-run IRNA news agency.

Citing "knowledgeable sources," IRNA said that the IAEA had closed off its inquiry over the recent discovery of traces of uranium enriched up to 83.7 per cent purity. A quarterly IAEA report in March said inspectors found the particles in Iran's underground Fordo nuclear site, further raising nonproliferation concerns as weapons-grade material is enriched to 90 per cent.

Sunak clamps down on free vapes for children

"My daughters are 10 and 12, and I don't want the way vapes are marketed, promoted and sold to be attractive to them," British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak said on Tuesday as he launched a crackdown to protect children from "rogue companies and online crooks".

Announcing the new set of measures aimed at curbing under-age vaping, Sunak said he expressed his shock at reports of illicit vapes containing lead getting into the hands of school-

children. Taking to Twitter, the father of schoolgirls Anoushka and Krishna said: "My daughters are 10 and 12, and I don't want the

way vapes are marketed, promoted and sold to be attractive to them." "That's why I am launching a new crackdown today to protect children and go

after the rogue companies and online crooks who are putting vapes into their hands," he said. A loophole that allows retailers to give free samples of vapes to

children in England is set to be closed under the new plans. While selling vapes to under 18s is illegal in the country, businesses have been found to be targeting children with colourful packaging of free samples. The UK government has also announced that there will be a review into banning retailers selling "nicotine-free" vapes to under-18s. "I am deeply concerned about the sharp rise in kids vaping and shocked by reports of illicit vapes containing lead getting into the hands of school children," Sunak said in a statement. "Our new illicit vape enforcement squad - backed by GBP 3 million - is on the case, but clearly there is more to do.

India's growth momentum to continue in FY24: RBI

PTI ■ MUMBAI

The Reserve Bank on Tuesday said that India's growth momentum is likely to continue in 2023-24 even as it made a case for pushing structural reforms to deal with the geopolitical developments and also to achieve sustained growth in the medium-term.

The Reserve Bank's annual report flagged slowing global growth, protracted geopolitical tensions and a possible upsurge in financial market volatility as possible downside risks to growth.

The report notes that volatility has ebbed in global financial markets and risks to financial stability from the failure of banks in some advanced economies (AEs) in March 2023 have eased. Resolute policy actions have stemmed the tide of confidence runs for now.

"Amidst strong global head-



winds, the Indian economy is expected to have recorded a growth of 7.0 per cent in real GDP in 2022-23," it said.

A sustained recovery in discretionary spending, particularly in contact intensive services, restoration of consumer confidence, high festival season spending after two consecutive years of COVID-19 induced isolation and the government's thrust on capex provided impetus to the growth momentum.

In the second half of the year, however, the pace of year-on-year growth moderated because of unfavourable base effects, weakening private consumption demand caused by high inflation, slowdown in export growth and

sustained input cost pressures, it said.

"On the back of sound macro-economic policies, softer commodity prices, a robust financial sector, a healthy corporate sector, continued fiscal policy thrust on quality of government expenditure, and new growth opportunities stemming from global realignment of supply chains, India's growth momentum is likely to be sustained in 2023-24 in an atmosphere of easing inflationary pressures," the report said.

Slowing global growth, protracted geopolitical tensions and a possible upsurge in financial market volatility following new stress events in the global financial system, however, could pose downside risks to growth.

"It is important, therefore, to sustain structural reforms to improve India's medium-term growth potential," the 311-page report said.

RBI working on light weight, portable payment system for critical transactions during catastrophic events

Reserve Bank of India is working on a light weight and portable payment system, a "bunker equivalent in payment systems", that can be used for critical transactions during catastrophic events like natural calamities and war.

The proposed Light weight and Portable Payment System (LPPS) will be independent of conventional technologies and can be operated from anywhere by a bare minimum staff, according to the central bank. Existing conventional payment systems like RTGS

(Real Time Gross Settlement), NEFT (National Electronic Funds Transfer) and UPI (Unified Payments Interface) are designed to handle large volumes while ensuring sustained availability. These systems are dependent on complex wired networks backed by advanced IT infrastructure.

However, catastrophic events like natural calamities and war have the potential to render these payment systems temporarily unavailable by disrupting the underlying information and communication infrastructure, RBI said in its latest annual report released on Tuesday.

CBDC pilot expanded; to include more banks, locations: Reserve Bank

The Reserve Bank on Tuesday said the scope of the Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) pilot is being expanded gradually to include more banks and locations.

The first pilot in the Digital Rupee - Wholesale Segment (e rupee-W) commenced on November 1, 2022. It was followed by the first pilot for retail digital rupee (e rupee-R) was announced on December 1, 2022.

Retail digital rupee offers features of physical cash like trust, safety and settlement finality in digital mode.

It can be held or used to carry out transactions, similar to how currency notes can be used in physical form, the RBI said in its annual report.

The pilot was launched in Mumbai, New Delhi, Bengaluru and Bhubaneswar,



comprising participating customers and merchants in a closed user group (CUG).

Other locations, including Ahmedabad, Chandigarh, Gangtok, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Indore, Kochi, Lucknow, Patna and Shimla are also being added to the pilot in phases.

The pilot began with four banks -- State Bank of India, ICICI Bank, Yes Bank and IDFC First Bank -- while four other banks -- Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, HDFC Bank and Kotak Mahindra Bank have joined subsequently.

Hardening interest rates, geo-political risks impacting FDI inflows: DPIIT Secy

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Hardening interest rates globally and worsening geo-political situation have impacted the foreign direct investment (FDI) inflows into India in 2022-23, a top government official said on Tuesday.

Secretary of the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) Rajesh Kumar Singh said that the department would analyse the reasons for the contraction in FDI in five important sectors like computer hardware and software; construction, education, automobiles and metallurgical industries.

"I cannot think of any other reason. It is not as if our FDI policies have become protectionist. On the contrary, we have kept it very very liberal ... The decline is combination of hardening of interest rates along with geo-political risks going up around the world. In general the appetite may be less," Singh told PTI in an interview.

These five sectors had a share of USD 30 billion in India's total FDI in 2021-22 and in the last fiscal year, overseas inflows have almost halved.

"Why exactly in those sectors (FDI) has come down is to be analysed. We will have to analyse," he added.

FDI equity inflows into India declined by 22 per cent to USD 46 billion in 2022-23. The investments during the January-March 2023 quarter plunged by 40.55 per cent to USD 9.28 billion.

Though the computer software and hardware sector attracted the highest inflows of USD 9.4 billion during the last financial year, these inflows are down as compared to USD 14.5 billion in 2021-22.

Similarly, FDI in the automobile industry dipped significantly to USD 1.9 billion in 2022-23 as compared to about USD 7 billion in 2021-22.

However, the secretary added that the government is doing investment promotion on a large scale and the inflows would start recovering.

The secretary added that sectors which have received healthy inflows include information and broadcasting, agri machinery, railway-related components, medical appliances, defence industries and scientific instruments.

Jadeja proved fairy tales exist in sport: Fleming

Stephen Fleming doesn't believe in fairy tales in sport but Ravindra Jadeja's near-improbable heist that took Chennai Super Kings to its fifth IPL trophy might come closest to it.

With 13 needed to win in the final over against Gujarat Titans, CSK managed only three runs off the first four balls before Jadeja smashed Mohit Sharma for a six and a four off the last two deliveries to literally snatch the Cup from Gujarat's grasp.

"They say there are no fairy tales in the sport, but it was a pretty good one today. It has been a bit difficult 18 months where, as the captaincy was difficult, the injury was difficult, it took a bit of time from out of the game for him to come back into and be reintegrated into the Test side, and then re-integrate into CSK," Fleming told the media after Chennai defeated Gujarat Titans in the IPL final here.

In fact, Fleming had in his mind conceded defeat before final two deliveries were bowled by Mohit and the Jadeja turned it all.

"We have lost finals on the last ball which is an absolute heartache. I was gearing up myself for another heartache when Jaddu hit one for six and there could have been more heartache or more joy, I was not sure.

"But when I saw the ball go down, finally there was pure joy. This competition takes you to emotional levels that you cannot imagine," the Kiwi added.

Fleming was all praise for Jadeja's firepower.

"He plays a great role with the ball, but we have got so much fire power, that some ways we use him down the order, but something has to give. MS (Dhoni) has been very supportive and proactive in getting him up there and today he repaid that faith," Fleming added.

The former New Zealand skipper explained Jadeja's shot selection.

"The six, I think, in particular of the ball which was pretty close to being perfect, was defining, and then left-handed drive to the fine leg. It was a great way to finish it. I could-



n't be more happy for him. There has been some frustration at times, but he is our gun player, he is a No 1 ranked player and today he delivered," Fleming added.

The CSK coach said his side was poor in the field in the first half, but kept getting better and confident as the rain-affected match panned out.

"215... I thought it was an excellent score but the rain came and we

had to change the momentum. We felt with the moisture around on the pitch, it was gettable. It was going to take a lot of batting.

"The start was really important because we were still shell-shocked from the fielding. The first four or six overs started to give us the belief and once we got a little bit of taste for it, it is that type of ground where it is very hard to defend, so we knew we

had a chance. It was going to be high octane all the way through," Fleming added.

Fleming praised Gujarat Titans bowlers Mohammad Shami and Mohit Sharma for taking the contest into the final ball of the match.

"The last couple of overs were very tight. Shami and Sharma bowled well, Mohit Sharma in particular has been very good," he said.

Cricket has always been a game of fine margins, believes Fleming, who has been CSK coach for a decade and half now.

"I think I said it a couple of days ago that this tournament is being defined by fine margins. I think the last couple of balls summed that up — if you just missed a yorker or go down the leg side.

"We have talked about that all the

way through, that if you can just get on the right side of those moments, then we can stay in and it was one of those days," Fleming said.

PRAISE FOR RAHANE

Fleming heaped praise on senior India batter Ajinkya Rahane, who turned out to be one of the success stories for the CSK side with an incredibly successful season with the bat. What changed was Rahane's philosophy of not trying to be an anchor batter.

"My understanding is that we got rid of the tag of being the guy you bat around or bat through. I think that maybe hung over his head a little bit too much and didn't allow him to be the player that he can be.

"And once that tag was gone, when I turned up halfway through the pre-season training, I saw a guy who was in magnificent form," Fleming said.

Fleming said that Rahane didn't feature in their initial thoughts.

"He wasn't in our initial thoughts, but the game in Mumbai was really defining. It was one of our best wins in the tournament and he was the big

Only you could do a miracle: Srinivasan tells Dhoni

The thrilling last ball win by Chennai Super Kings in the IPL final against Gujarat Titans "is a miracle" and only the legend Mahendra Singh Dhoni could pull off such a show, noted industrialist and India Cements Vice Chairman N Srinivasan said on Tuesday.

He advised Dhoni to take rest following the back-to-back match schedule over the past few days, and invited him to visit Chennai along with the team to celebrate the victory.

"This season has been one where the fans have demonstrated how much they love M S Dhoni. So do we," Srinivasan, who was overwhelmed by the affection shown by CSK fans, said.

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"He wasn't in our initial thoughts, but the game in Mumbai was really defining. It was one of our best wins in the tournament and he was the big

catalyst behind it, so he cemented that No. 3 spot.

"He has been unwavering the whole way through he's been nothing but positive, his nets have been positive. Anytime he's been caught on the boundary or out playing a big shot, we've just reinforced how good he's playing. 'RAYUDU WOULD LEAVE A BIG HOLE'

The former New Zealand captain said Ambati Rayudu, who announced his retirement after this IPL final, will leave a big hole in their side.

"Ambati Rayudu has been an absolute legend. I rate him so highly as a batter and those three balls against Mohit Sharma today proved against one of the most in-form bowlers... to hit him for 6, 4 and 6 was sheer class.

"Rayudu will leave a hole, there is no doubt about it, but the game keeps moving. Doesn't it? We expected that for him to go out like that was pretty emotional within the group and for him as well," Fleming said.

It will be a big challenge for India to come out of T20 mould and play WTC final: Gavaskar

Legendary cricketer Sunil Gavaskar feels emerging from the IPL T20 mode will be the biggest challenge for the Indian players when they take on Australia in the World Test Championship (WTC) final against Australia next week.

Rohit Sharma's India will play the WTC final at The Oval from June 7 with a majority of the players having come through the rigours of IPL, which concluded on Monday with Chennai Super Kings lifting the trophy for a record-equalling fifth time.

"The biggest test will be the fact that just about everybody will be coming out of a T20 for-

mat, and Test cricket is a longer format. So, I think that's going to be the big challenge," said Gavaskar on Star Sports on Tuesday.

He added that among all the India players only veteran batter Cheteshwar Pujara was well acclimatised to the longer format as he has been playing county cricket.

"They (India) have only Cheteshwar Pujara who has been playing in the English County Championship, so he will be the only guy who has played the longer format in these conditions, so that's going to be the big challenge for them."

On Ajinkya Rahane, who after a long form slump has come back strongly in the IPL and helped CSK win the title this season, Gavaskar said the 34-year-old's experience of English conditions will be beneficial to the side.

"He's got a lot of experience having played in England, having scored runs in England. So, yes, I think he is going to be crucial down at number 5. And yes, I do believe he has a point to prove. I still feel he has got plenty of cricket left in him, and this is a wonderful opportunity for him."

Hard thing would be to work hard for nine months and try to play another IPL: Dhoni

Chennai Super Kings' triumphant captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni has not yet ruled out playing in the IPL next year but said his body will have to hold up to feature in yet another season.

Under the 41-year-old Dhoni's leadership, CSK won a record-equalling fifth IPL title with a five-wicket victory over Gujarat Titans in the summit

clash here on Monday.

"Circumstantially, this is the best time to announce my retirement. But the amount of love I have received all over, the easy thing would be to walk away from here, but the harder thing would be to work hard for nine months and try to play another IPL," Dhoni said after the final.

Dhoni has been the cynosure of all eyes ever since the Indian Premier League began this year and in a fitting end to

the finale, the captain finished with a record-leaving fifth trophy. His fans from across the country went to the venues in large numbers to cheer for him, chanting his name wherever CSK have played this season.

"It would be a gift from me, won't be easy on the body. You

do get emotional, the first game at CSK everyone was chanting my name. My eyes were full of water, I needed to take some time off in the dugout.

"I realised I need to enjoy this. I think they love me for what I am, I don't try to portray something I'm not. Just keep it

simple," Dhoni said.

Speaking about the final, Dhoni said, "Every trophy is special, but what is special about IPL is every crunch game you need to be ready. There were lapses today, the bowling department didn't work, but it was the batting department that took the

pressure off them today.

"I do get frustrated, it is human but I try to step into their shoes, every individual deals with pressure differently. Ajinkya (Rahane) and a few others are experienced, so you don't worry. If anyone is confused, then can always ask."

Destiny had this written for him: Hardik on Dhoni leading CSK to fifth IPL title

Gujarat Titans skipper Hardik Pandya paid rich tributes to his mentor and rival captain MS Dhoni, saying "destiny had this written for him" to lead Chennai Super Kings to a record-equalling fifth IPL title in what could be his last season in the lucrative league.

CSK beat GT by five wickets in a thrilling rain-affected summit showdown with Ravindra Jadeja smashing a six and a four off the last two balls to chase down a revised target of 171 in 15 overs here on Monday.

"I'm very happy for him (Dhoni). Destiny had this written for him," Pandya said after

the heartbreaking loss.

"If I had to lose, I don't mind losing to him. Good things happen to good people and he's been one of the best people I know. God has been kind, God has been kind to me as well but today was his night," added the India white-ball all-rounder who led GT to title triumph in 2022.

Dhoni himself has not yet ruled out playing in the IPL next year but said for that to happen, his body will have to hold up.

Jadeja, who remained not out on 15 off just six balls, dedicated the title win to his skipper Dhoni. "I would like to dedicate this win to a special member of the CSK side, MS Dhoni," Jadeja said.

"Feels amazing, winning my fifth title in front of my home crowd. I'm from Gujarat, and it's a special feeling. This crowd has been amazing. They were waiting for rain to stop till late night, I'd like to say a big congratulations to the CSK fans who came to support us."

On his six and four off the last two balls, Jadeja said, "I was just thinking I need to swing hard, as much as I can. Where the ball will go, I was not thinking about that, just looking to swing hard."

"I was backing myself and looking to hit straight, because I know Mohit can bowl those slower balls."

GT failed to defend their title but Pandya said he would

not have asked more from the team.

"We tick a lot of boxes and played with our heart. We've always been a team that has stood together and no one gave up. We win together and we lose together. Maybe one of those games today, I'm not one of those guys who makes excuses. CSK played better cricket."

"Special mention to Sai as well. He is going to do wonders in his life. I'm really happy for the guys. We've been backing them and their success has been their success. Mohit, Shami, Rashid everyone, the way they put their hand up. Special mention to the coaching staff as well. I can't ask anything more from them."

Satwik-Chirag pair achieves career-best ranking

He is 20th. Lakshya Sen, however, slipped a place to world no. 23 after an early exit from the Malaysia Masters. In women's singles, double Olympic medalist PV Sindhu remained static at 13th spot, while Treasa Jolly and Gayatri Gopichand also stayed at the 15th position in women's doubles.

Sameer, Kiran, Ashmita enter main draw of Thailand Open

Indian shuttlers Sameer Verma, Kiran George and Ashmita Chaliha notched up straight-game wins over their respective opponents in the qualifying round to progress to the main draw of the singles event at the Thailand Open Super 500 badminton tournament here on Tuesday.

On a comeback trail, former world number 11 Sameer, who won the Slovenia Open recently, beat Malaysia's Yeoh Seng Zoe 21-12, 21-17 after getting two walkovers — Indonesia's Christian Adinata and Spain's Luis Enrique Penalver in the previous rounds.

The 28-year-old from Dhar, who had won three titles in 2018, will face Denmark's Magnus

Johannesen in the opening round of the main draw. Kiran, the 2022 Odisha Open winner, outwitted fellow Indian Kartikey Gulshan Kumar 21-14, 21-18 and then defeated Korea's Jeon Hyeok Jin 21-10, 21-14 to make it to the main draw. He will face third seed Chinese Shi Yuqi on Wednesday.

In women's singles, Ashmita Chaliha, who recently topped BAI's selection trials to make it to individual events of the upcoming Asian Games, saw off fellow Indian Unnati Hooda 21-16, 13-21, 21-19 before beating Estonian Kristin Kuuba 21-19, 21-11 in the second match.

The girl from Assam will meet compatriot Malvika Bansod, who was promoted to the main draw.

Hardik could have been valuable addition for India in WTC final: Ponting

Batting legend Ricky Ponting feels that India should have picked Hardik Pandya in their squad for the World Test Championships final against Australia in London, saying his all-round abilities could have turned out to be the deciding factor in the one-off game.

Pandya has not played a Test since 2018 and he has opted sit out of the five-day format due to ongoing fitness concerns.

But Ponting felt Pandya could have played in the winner-takes all clash at The Oval from June 7-11. Primarily because he has bowled in more or less every game in the just-concluded IPL for Gujarat Titans which he captains.

"...I thought about the other day for India in this game is how valuable someone like Hardik Pandya could be in a one-off Test match," Ponting wrote for



the ICC Review.

"I know he is on record saying that the Test match game is probably a little bit hard on his body. But for a one-off game... He's been bowling every game through this IPL and he's bowling quick."

The former Australia captain, also the head coach of Delhi Capitals in the IPL, said Pandya

could have been the X-factor for the Indian team in the WTC final beginning on June 7.

"He (Pandya) could be that X-factor there just to pick in a one-off game, come in and see what he can do with bat and ball. He could be the difference between the two teams."

The 29-year-old Pandya has played in 11 Tests till now after making his debut in 2017, scoring 532 runs at an average of 31.29 with one hundred and four fifties. He has taken 17 wickets at an average of 31.05.

In the 74 ODIs he has played so far, Pandya has scored 1584 runs at an average of 33.00 and taken 72 wickets. In the T20s, he has scored 1271 runs from 87 matches and scalped 69 wickets.

Pandya led Gujarat Titans to maiden IPL triumph in 2022 but lost to Mahendra Singh Dhoni's Chennai Super Kings in this season's final on Monday.

MEDVEDEV OUT OF FRENCH OPEN

World number two Daniil Medvedev was knocked out of the French Open in the first round on Tuesday, losing in five sets to 172nd-ranked Thiago Seyboth Wild of Brazil.

Seyboth Wild, who came through the qualifiers and had never previously won a Grand Slam match, triumphed 7-6 (7/5), 6-7 (6/8), 2-6, 6-3, 6-4. It was Medvedev's fifth loss in the opening round at Roland Garros in seven appearances.

"I have watched Daniil play in my junior years. It's a dream come true to beat these kinds of players on this court," said the 23-year-old Brazilian who unleashed 69 winners past the Russian.

"I just wanted to get my angles right, get to the net as much as possible and use my forehand as much as possible against his — I guess it worked pretty well." He added: "I was cramping in the second set and couldn't really serve the way I wanted to but I tried to play my best tennis. I'm really happy with the way I played."

Seyboth Wild, without a win on the main tour since February 2022, had squandered two set points which would have given him a two-sets lead.

Medvedev made him pay, levelling the tie and then claiming a double break in the third set.

But the Brazilian hit back, a double break of his own in the fourth set levelling the clash as a fractious Medvedev bickered with the crowd.

In the final set, Seyboth Wild twice saw breaks retrieved by the Russian before he finally backed up a third break with a hold for 5-3.

He held his nerve to clinch the four-hour 15-minute match courtesy of two giant forehands and will face either Guido Pella or Quentin Halys for a place in the last 32.

Medvedev arrived in Paris buoyed by winning his first ever clay court title at the prestigious Italian Open last week for his fifth trophy of 2023.

But he has endured a bitter-sweet relationship with the French Open, losing in the first round in his first four visits. He ended that streak with a run to the quarter-finals in 2021.

ZVEREV WINS

Alexander Zverev made a winning return to Roland Garros on Tuesday with a straight-sets win over Lloyd Harris in the French Open first round,



12 months since suffering a serious ankle injury in the semi-finals.

The German had to retire injured from a dramatic last-four clash with Rafael Nadal last season after twisting his ankle and did not play again in 2022.

That match had already reached three hours and was locked at 6-6 in the second set after Nadal won a first-set tie-break when Zverev suffered torn ankle ligaments and had to be taken off Court Philippe Chatrier in a wheelchair.

Zverev, who was the third seed last

year, is only seeded 22nd this time around after struggling to recapture his best form since returning to the ATP Tour.

But the former US Open finalist had enough to beat South African Harris 7-6 (8/6), 7-6 (7/0), 6-1.

"It's nice to be back. I've marked this day in bold on my calendar since last year," Zverev said.

"I was obviously very disappointed with how that tournament ended for me (last year).

"That's why I think I appreciate even more when I play in a full stadium and the crowd is behind me."

Zverev went out in the first round in 2017 and needed five sets to win his opening tie at Roland Garros in both 2019 and 2021.

"No (not happy with his performance). But I'm happy that I won in three sets. Normally I start with five-set matches so I'm happy to win in three."

Zverev will next face Slovakia's Alex

Molcan as he tries to reach the third round for a sixth straight year.

He came back to the Tour at the start of 2023 but has since slipped from 12th to 27th in the rankings.

Zverev, who has won three of his five Masters titles on clay, failed to reach the quarter-finals in each of Monte Carlo, Madrid and Rome this season.

"Get some more wins. Get six more wins in the next two weeks," said the Olympic champion when asked what he wants to improve.



Van der Sar to quit as Ajax chief after 'tough period'

Former Netherlands goalkeeper Edwin van der Sar on Tuesday announced that he was quitting as Ajax chief executive, after "an incredibly tough period" of more than a decade at the helm of the Amsterdam powerhouse.

Van der Sar's resignation comes on the back of the worst season in 14 years for the top Dutch club which finished third in the Eredivisie after a 3-1 drubbing by FC Twente on Sunday.

"After almost 11 years on the board, I am done," Van der Sar, 52, said in a statement.

"We have experienced wonderful things together, but it has also been an incredibly tough period," the former Manchester United keeper said, who retired from professional football in 2011.

Ajax failed to qualify for the Champions League after finishing third in the Eredivisie behind Feyenoord and PSV Eindhoven.

Media reports including the NOS public broadcaster and daily tabloid De Telegraaf said supporters held Van der Sar responsible for the club's drop in success, following the departure of sporting director Marc Overmars and trainer Erik ten

Hag. Former Dutch international Overmars quit after admitting sending inappropriate messages to female staff at Ajax, while the successful Ten Hag left for Manchester United in April last year.

Van der Sar said he needed to "take some distance, to get some rest, and to do other things."

Ajax supervisory board chairman Pier Eringa said the club "wanted Edwin to stay, but he had made his decision. We have to respect that."

Van der Sar's contract ran until June 30, 2025.

"The last season does not reflect the entire period that he has been in charge of Ajax," Eringa stressed.

Regarded as one of the world's all-time best goalkeepers, Van der Sar played for Ajax from 1990-1999, winning the Champions League in 1995.

He went on to lift the European Cup again in 2008 with Manchester United after spells at Juventus and Fulham.

Van der Sar returned to Ajax in 2012 as director of marketing before being promoted four years later to CEO. He is also the second-highest capped Netherlands player of all-time with 130 international appearances.
