# TS-iPass attracts investment worth Rs 2.61 lakh crore

The TS-IPass has given approvals to projects worth Rs 2.61 lakh crore. As on May 11, 2023, 23,065 units with a proposed invest-

ment of Rs 2,61,732 crore with an e m p l o y m e n t potential of 15,74,798 have been approved. A total of 18,587 units

with an invest-**COMMISSIONER OF** ment of Rs 1,54,690 crore is employing 9,13,386 persons. That is, 81% of the units which have obtained approvals have commenced operations as per data released by the Telangana government.

The Government of Telangana enacted the TS-iPASS (Telangana State Industrial Project Approval and Self Certification System) Act for providing all approvals to entrepreneurs at a single point within a set time based on self-certification

furnished by entrepreneurs to accelerate industrial growth and to make Telangana the favoured destination of investments.

Mega projects will get automatic approvals on submission of self-certification. All applicants will be bestowed with the right to clearance under TS-iPASS.

There is a provi-

sion for imposing penalties on officers who fail to provide clearance within the set time. The system has been appreciated all over the country and it has been treated as a best practice by the

Meanwhile, from 02-06-2014 to 31-03-2023, incentives worth Rs 3,654.57 crore were sanctioned to 25,068 proposals under T-IDEA (Telangana State Industrial Development and Entrepreneur

Advancement).

# Irrigation for 50L acres in 3 years

The Telangana government is trying to create an irrigation potential of 50 lakh acres in the next 3 to 4 years, that is, 17 lakh acres in 2023-24, 14 lakh acres in 2024-25, and 19 lakh acres after 2025. Irrigation projects under construction can achieve the targeted irrigation potential of 1.25 crore acres in Telangana.

The total irrigation potential created in the State is 75 lakh acres (including 58 lakh acres till 2014) and stabilization of 32 lakh acres under major, medium and minor irrigation projects.

So far, the total irrigation potential created is 75.10 lakh acres and balance of 50.25 lakh acres is scheduled to be created in the next three years. 26 projects (19 Major and 7 Medium) are scheduled to be completed in the next two to three years.

The state is steadily progressing major and medium irrigation projtowards the goal of irrigating 1.25 crore acres due to the initiatives taken by the Telangana Government in the last nine years.

Utmost priority is being given for completing irrigation projects in the next 3 to 4 years for developing agriculture which has been neglected for

The budget allocated for major and medium irrigation projects in 2023-24 is Rs 9,381.34 crore.

The Telangana Government has given the highest priority to the creation of infrastructure to irrigate 125 lakh acres in the state against the total cultivable area of 167 lakh acres.

An ayacut of about 15.80 lakh acres and 15.26 lakh acres, which includes SRSP II and Nizamsagar Ayacut, was stabilized through the Kaleshwaram Project in the last two years. Around 50% of 3 TMC works are completed and 91% of land acquisition is over.

It is proposed to complete the project by December 2023 followed by completion of the canal system in 2 to 3 years. The Palamuru Ranga Reddy Lift Irrigation Scheme (PRLIS) canal system is scheduled to be completed in the next two to three years.

The government has allocated Rs 596 crore for O&M works in 2022-23. The State experienced heavy rains during monsoon 2022 and it damaged many irrigation struc-

Field engineers used the enhanced financial powers given under GO: 45 to take up emergency repairs and restore systems to ensure uninterrupted water supply to the ayacut with proper maintenance of gates and canals.

The government also issued GO: 20 with specific guidelines for the timely maintenance of all pumping

## PNS MUMBAI Advertising industry's self-regulato-

ry body ASCI on Tuesday announced tweaks in its guidelines for educational bodies' campaigns, asking them to refrain from stereotyping low scoring students as unsuccessful or failures.

'While fierce pressure in education is a reality, advertising must not perpetuate this problem, normalise it or exploit student and parental vulnerability," Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI) secretary general and chief executive Manisha Kapoor said.

The body said it has made the changes following a consultative process, and the guidelines seek to focus on students' mental health and physical well-being.

Éducational institutions, includ-



ing universities, colleges and schools, coaching classes and edtech platforms need to comply with the revised guidelines, as per an official

statement. In FY23, classical education ranked second among the top violative categories with 13.8 per cent of

ASCI's guidelines.

Education sector advertisers should not "stereotype students based on their gender, or appearance, nor portray those who score low as unsuccessful or failures", body has suggested.

Campaigns must not create a false sense of urgency or fear of missing out that could accentuate anxieties amongst school students, or their parents, it said.

They should not suggest that certain subjects are associated with par-

ticular genders alone, or that students with high scores are always associated with stereotypical characteristics such as wearing thick glasses, ASCI said. "The ASCI guidelines address the various issues that plague the sector and we hope that the industry will follow these in letter and spirit," secretary in the Ministry of Consumer Affairs Rohit Kumar Singh said.

Yesteryear chief ministers did not insist on linking their names with those schemes for sheer publicity. These days chief ministers inscribe their names as prefixes to every welfare scheme. The term 'Chandranna' could be found in almost every

scheme implemented in the state during the rule of TDP president N. Chandrababu Naidu. Now, the term has made way for 'Jagananna', reflecting the name of YSRCP president YS Jaganmohan

Présently, with almost everything available at their doorstep in the name welfare schemes, the working class is kicking its habit of working to

Residual AP started its

Instead, the successive rulers made visits to World Economic Forum summits at huge costs to the exchequer – at least Rs. 15 crore each – but returned almost empty-handed.

Nobody knows whether any industrial unit of signficance has been grounded in the state following MoUs signed at the WEF summits.

The YSRCP government has spent Rs. 2.10 crore on welfare schemes, using mostly borrowed funds. The AP government gets loans at huge interest rates. Such loans are not supposed to exceed 30% of its annual income. Yet, AP has willingly crossed this limit. Amidst this fiscal indiscipline, the state government has no qualms telling people that Rs. 2.10 crore had been distributed among lakhs of beneficiaries, suggesting that the borrowings were made only for them!

The TDP, at its recent Mahanadu in Rajahmundry, brought out its manifesto full of freebies with a view to return to power. The promised schemes have striking similarities with those launched by YSRCP: offers of paying Rs.15,000 to every schoolgoing child in the family, monthly cash allowance of Rs. 1,500 to women; and unemployment allowance of Rs. 3,000 to youth, among others.

As they say, "a statesman thinks about the next generation, while a politician thinks only about the next election". Going by the skewed approaches of YSRCP and TDP, where would the state go with its mounting debts tomorrow? What path is left for the person who would be ruling the state tomorrow? As things stand, the financial position of AP is so bad that the government can't easily pay salaries to its employees on the first of every month. There is nearly Rs.2 lakh debt burden on the head of every

# Order probe into ORR deal

PNS HYDERABAD

Telangana BJP president Bandi Sanjay Kumar demanded that Minister Chandrasekhar Rao should order a comprehensive inquiry into the irregularities in the ORR tender process. He sent a letter to the Chief Minister on Tuesday regarding this.

He said in the letter that there are allegations of gross corruption by the government in awarding Outer Ring Road (ORR) toll tender. "As the Chief Minister, it is your responsibility to respond on those allegations and clear suspicions," he said. He said that already every year the ORR is generating Rs 415 crore. Even if it increases by just 5% every seven years, the government will get Rs 30,000 crore in 30 years.

"What is the reason behind the government not exploiting this? Why was the tender awarded to a private company by forsaking revenue that should have come to the state? Why is the government secretive about this?" he asked.

Sanjay said that IRB Infrastructure Developers Limited, which got the ORR lease is responsible for maintaining the Mumbai-Pune Expressway and for collecting toll. Its range is 1,014 lane km, contract period 10 years and

E-store India made grand promises of providing the necessary infrastructure, managing rental expenses, hiring staff, and ensuring monthly profits. Police said that the victims received profits for only a short period before experiencing sudden defaults, plunging them into significant losses.

# Direct selling firms resurface with bogus ops

**PNS** ■ HYDERABAD

Hyderabad City Police have busted several direct selling companies, uncovering a bogus company operating within the premises of Swapnalok Complex, where four persons lost their lives in a fire accident. The Central Crime Station has apprehended three individuals involved in fraudulent marketing practices and identified 150 vic-

tims who have been deceived. Hyderabad Commissioner of Police CV Ananad revealed

based direct sales company that has been involved in several court trails and controversies for allegedly scamming many people has relaunched its sub-franchise Vihaan Direct Selling India Pvt. Ltd. Police revealed that 12 accused individuals who established a bogus company named V-

Empire at Swapnalok Complex, were identified. The victims, predominantly unemployed youth and innocent members of the pub-

lic, were enticed with the

promise of monthly returns ranging from Rs 20,000 to Rs 60,000 based on their investments, which ranged from Rs 50,000 to Rs 1.5 lakh. The collective loss suffered by the victims amounts to Rs 3 crore. Additionally, 35 bank accounts belonging to Vihaan Direct Selling Pvt. Ltd. and others, with a total of Rs 54 crore have been frozen.

According to police, the prime accused, Rajesh Khanna, along with others, lured victims by conducting motivation classes and

promising lucrative returns through an e-commerce business. They operated a pyramid scheme disguised as a direct selling business, which is strictly prohibited under the Telangana government's direct selling guidelines issued in

CP Anand said, "These companies that have been notorious for being involved in such scams, are re-entering the scene with new names. They approach the public with Registrar of Companies certification and people believe

a major concern, these multilevel marketing schemes are also a major cause of concern where people get cheated." The official urged the pub-

lic to exercise caution and be aware of schemes that may violate local guidelines and regulations, such as the Telangana Direct Selling Guidelines of 2017. He emphasised the importance of reporting any suspicious schemes to the nearest police to protect the public from potential scam.

# India a major partner in UN's transformation of peacekeeping

India is a "major partner" in the UN's strategy for the digital transformation of peacekeeping, the United Nations peacekeeping chief has said, as he lauded the country's commitment and engagement through key initiatives such as ensuring accountability for crimes against the Blue Helmets.

India is currently the third largest contributor of uniformed personnel to UN Peacekeeping, with over 6,000 military and police personnel deployed to Abyei, the Central African Republic, Cyprus, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Lebanon, the Middle East and Western Sahara.

"India is a major player in the world, in the UN, in multilateralism, and it's a major player in peacekeeping as well, including but not only through the importance of its contribution in terms of troops and police. We're also supported in many other ways, including in terms of the initiatives that we take to improve



peacekeeping," Under-Secretary General for Peace Operations Jean-Pierre Lacroix said in an exclusive interview.

The UN peacekeeping chief highlighted the "important role" played by peacekeepers from India, one of the significant troop and police-contributing countries to UN peacekeeping. Lacroix said that India's

"engagement and commitment" in support of peace operations is critical, both politically through its contribution and in support of the department's initiatives. He further underlined the

role of India in supporting our initiative to make sure that peace operations will be up to speed in terms of digital technologies because this is absolutely critical. We have a strategy for the digital transformation of peacekeeping. And India is a major partner in that regard," he said.

The UN marked 75 years of peacekeeping and commemorated the International Day of UN Peacekeepers on May 29 with this year's theme of "Peace begins with me'. Three Indian peacekeepers,

who lost their lives serving under the UN flag last year, were among the 103 military, police, and civilian peacekeepers honoured posthumously with the prestigious Dag Hammarskj ld Medal at a solemn ceremony last week. Border Security Force personnel Head Constables Shishupal Singh and Sanwala Ram Vishnoi, who served with the Organisation Stabilisation Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO) and Shaber Taher Ali, who served in a civil-

Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI) were awarded the medal posthumously at UN headquarters on May 25.

Under its Presidency of the Security Council in August 2021, India, in collaboration with the UN, announced the rollout of the UNITE AWARE platform, a "situational awareness software programme that allows a Peacekeeping Operations Centre to visualise and analyse the ground situa-tion in a conflict zone on a realtime basis.

Earlier this year, India deployed a platoon of women peacekeepers to the UN Mission in Abyei, the country's largest single unit of female Blue Helmets in a UN mission since 2007, heralding New Delhi's intent of increasing significantly the number of women in peacekeeping contingents. The platoon is deployed in Abyei as part of the Indian Battalion in the United Nations Interim Security Force, Abyei (UNISFA).

## 10 Vaishno Devi pilgrims dead, 57 injured in Jammu bus accident

Ten Vaishno Devi pilgrims, most of them from Bihar, were killed and 57 injured on Tuesday as the bus they were travelling in skidded off the road and rammed into the railing of a bridge before falling off it, officials said.

The death toll may go up as Government Medical College Hospital Principal Shashi Soodan said two of the injured admitted there are critical.

The officials said the bus, which was on its way to Katra from Amritsar, met with the accident in Jhajjar Kotli area on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway between 6.30 and 7 am. Katra is a base camp for the pilgrims visiting the famous shrine atop the Trikuta hills.

They said most of the travellers were members of an extended family from Bihar's Lakhisarai and were on pilgrimage to Vaishno Devi temple for a ritual of a child.

# 'One cannot malign judicial officers by using social media'

One cannot malign judicial officers by using social media, the Supreme Court observed on Tuesday while dismissing a plea challenging a Madhya Pradesh High Court order that sentenced a man to 10 days in jail for making corruption allegations against a district judge.

"Just because you don't get a favourable order doesn't mean that you will malign the judicial officer. Independence of (the) judiciary doesn't just mean independence from (the) executive but also from outside forces. This has to be a lesson for others also.

"He should have thought twice before casting any aspersion on the judicial officer. He maligned the judicial officer. Think of the damage done to the judicial officer's image," Justice Trivedi observed oral-



The counsel appearing for the petitioner sought leniency from the Supreme Court and said the imprisonment order was excessive.

The lawyer said this is a matter pertaining to personal liberty and the applicant has already been in jail since May

The top court bench then remarked, "We're here to decide on law, not show mercy. Especially to such persons.'

The apex court was hearing a plea filed by Krishna Kumar Raghuvanshi, challenging the high court judgment in a suo initiated against him for making allegations of corruption against a district judge.

The proceedings were initiated against Raghuvanshi in response to a reference made by Additional District Judge SPS Bandela under Section 15(2) of the Contempt of Courts Act.

The reference was based on Raghuvanshi's defiance of the court's orders in a temple-related dispute and his circulation of a letter maligning the court's image, reputation and prestige

## Retailers asked not to take consumers' mobile numbers without consent

"I urge upon you to suitably advise the retailers that the mobile number of the consumers should not be taken without their express consent at the time of sale of any goods or services and, providing the same should not be made a mandatory pre-condition for sale," Singh said in the letter dated May 26. The secretary noted that a number of grievances are being registered on the National Consumer Helpline (NCH) about the fact that many retail stores are compelling consumers to submit their mobile numbers

before purchasing a product.

In case of denial to provide the mobile number, consumers were in many cases denied their rights under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 by retailers, either declining to sell the product or service and/or also rejecting any refund, exchange etc, the secre-

The Delhi Police will suggest alternative sites that are designated for protests such as Ramleela Ground and Burari, the source added.

On Monday, the police said they would not be allowed to protest at Jantar Mantar.

# **Confident Congress**

The party hopes to reconcile the differences between Gehlot and Pilot

lictory, John F Kennedy said, has a thousand fathers. All of them nourish it further, making it grow strong, resilient and confident. The landslide mandate that the Congress received in the recently-concluded Assembly election in Karnataka seems to have galvanised the grand old party in more than one way. It has certainly broken the toxic mix of sloth and inertia on fratricide in Rajasthan. On Monday, the high command summoned Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and his political rival and former deputy Sachin Pilot to Delhi. The duo had four-hour-long discussions with Rahul Gandhi and party president Mallikarjun Kharge. "Both leaders have unanimously decided to work together and left the decision on the high command," senior party leader KC Venugopal reportedly said after the meeting without divulging any details. On the face of it, this was an anodyne statement, but GOP leaders must have heaved a sigh of relief that the two desert warriors sat together after a long time. This is important



as the Assembly election in Rajasthan is due later this year, especially as the State is known for changing government every five years. As it is, the no-holdsbarred fight between Gehlot and Pilot has hurt the party's image in the State. Some time ago, the party may have feared a repeat of Rajasthan in Karnataka. Now, having reconciled the differences between Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and State party chief DK Shivakumar, the GOP would like to do a Karnataka in Rajasthan.

It may not be easy, though, for the Congress. The fight between Gehlot and Pilot was quite intense in which many red lines were crossed. Gehlot had made several uncharitable remarks about Pilot. Pilot, on his

part, had been denouncing the Gehlot Government over inaction on alleged corruption during the previous BJP government under Vasundhara Raje. The big question is: would Gehlot and Pilot be willing to bury the hatchet? It is not just the GOP leadership but the entire Opposition would like them to, for if that happens, not only the Congress would be in a stronger position to take on the Bharatiya Janata Party in the forthcoming State polls but also in the 2024 general election. Further, as an upshot, the entire Opposition would gain strength. Many Opposition leaders are trying to forge an alliance against the Bharatiya Janata Party. Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar will be holding a meeting in Patna in a few days; Nationalist Congress Party leader Sharad Pawar is working towards that end. All these attempts, along with the Congress' newfound confidence, can make arithmetic favourable for the Opposition, but that may not be enough. As we mentioned earlier, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is not the BJP's solitary trump card; the saffron party has also been able to entrench its narrative in political debate—the narrative of muscular nationalism, Hindutva, and unprecedented infrastructure development. The Opposition doesn't have a viable alternative to that.

# Indo-Nepal ties will flourish on trust



Political engagement between the countries is missing for some time now. The historicity of bilateral relations will depend on Prachanda's longevity as PM

M Pushpa Kamal Dahal Prachanda will finally arrive today on a four days visit. Prachanda's first visit was a state visit when he came after the 10 April 2008 Constituent Assembly elections to 575 elected seats (out of 601) after the monarchy was dismantled and Nepal declared a federal democratic, secular republic. Prachanda who won peace after ten years of civil war, became Nepal's charismatic leader and beloved hero, his party winning 227 seats more than Nepali Congress (110)and CPN UML (103) combined.

It was a rude shock for India which had put its money on Vepali Congress. Still, it tried to adjust to Maoist ways to give Prachanda a grand welcome with the expectation that he would be sensitive to India's concerns and national interests. That hope was belied as Prachanda had ideas of a People's Republic chasing which he was forced to resign. The rest is a legend. In the second CA elections in November 2013, Maoists won 81 seats. Prachanda's second visit was in 2016-17 when he switched to NC from UML for power-sharing with NC PM Sher Bahadur Deuba. After the 2017 elections, Maoists won 53 seats and were forced to join the Left alliance which won a nearly twothirds majority but Prachanda's hopes of becoming Prime Minister in a power-sharing deal with PM KP Oli never materialised.

In November 2022 elections his party slumped to 32 seats but all through the electoral cycles, CPN (Maoist Centre) even with declining numbers, remained the number 3 party – the kingmakers – with NC and UML alternating as the single largest party. Prachanda's reduced strength and power had not dimmed his ambition to be the prime minister. He demonstrated political dexterity in switching coalitions earlier this year to remain PM. Nepal's mixed electoral system makes a single-party majority unlikely.

The three by-polls held in April in which RSP won two seats with overwhelming numbers including one from an NC stronghold have rung alarm bells for all political parties. Prachanda wants to revive the fortune of Maoists with India's help. That is why Prachanda wants to make his present visit historic and a game changer in India-Nepal relations for which he has to win back India's trust and most of all, the trust of the people of Nepal. He is now part of the eight-party coalition led by NC, along with CPN (Unified Socialist), Janata Samajwadi Party, Loktantrik Samajwadi Party, Janmat Party, Nagarik Unmukti Party and Rashtriya Jan Morcha. It is a different Prachanda who as Prime Minister leads the coalition and his party. He has to undo the pro-China image that he shed long ago that went unnoticed by New Delhi's political elite. This will not be easy in a Left-Right coalition.

Prachanda has to remould his party with a makeover of leadership. India should be impressed that Prachanda unlike in 2008 when he went to China first, has this time declined Beijing's invitation for the Boao Forum in March and declared his intention to

visit India first despite the scheduling and cabinet formation difficulties. New Delhi has not sent the right signals by failing to give an earlier date for his visit. It would have added to the credibility and stability of the coalition government. During the last Prime Ministerial visit of Mr Deuba last year, no major agreements were signed. Wait, watch and act after the November 2022 elections were India's policy. Mr Dahal has proved his nimbleness by securing three votes of confidence, signing two Common Minimum Programmes and getting the

budget passed last Monday. He is also seen to be acting against corruption.

One of the key expectations of Nepal is a more fair and liberal power trade agreement. At a power summit held in Kathmandu in April, Nepalese power traders complained that India had not provided full access to power markets as per the MoU of 2014. New Delhi has so far permitted the sale of 452.6 wants to sell 1000MW of interdependent. power. During this time, engage in activities that successfully divert your attention. Consider venturing into a smoke-free zone within your vicinity. Employing these simple but effective tactics might be sufficient

to surmount the craving. **Channel Your Chewing** Impulses- Offer your mouth an alternative activity to ward off tobacco cravings. Chew on sugarless gum or relish a piece of hard candy or else savour the crunch of raw carrots, nuts, or sunflower seeds for distraction.

Beware of the Illusion of **"Just One"**- The allure of succumbing to the illusion of satisfying a smoking craving with a single cigarette is compelling. However, do not deceive yourself into believing that

stopping at one will suffice. More often than not, indulging in a solitary cigarette will lead to another.

Harness the Power of Physical Activity-Physical exertion possesses the capacity to divert your attention away from tobacco or smoking cravings. Even brief bursts of activity, such as ascending and descending stairs several times, can successfully reduce the craving, or a brisk walk or jog.

Quitting smoking is one of the best things you can do for your health with these innovative ways depending on the individual's preferences. Some people find success with nicotine replacement therapy, while others prefer to quit cold turkey. Several support groups can aid avid smokers in quitting. No matter which method you choose, it is important to be patient and persistent because quitting smoking is not easy, however, it is certainly worth it. for your health. (The writer is Senior

# **FIRST COLUMN BE MINDFUL OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS**


Mindfulness can be practised by anyone irrespective of any faith or religion

# Children with disabilities need robust policies for support

The National Family Health Survey must include specific questions about disabilities to help formulate appropriate policy

ndia has 2.68 crore persons with a disability, according to the 2011 Census. However, with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, of 2016, now recognizing 21 types of disabilities, this number is expected to increase manifold. A robust policy is critical to encompass their aspirations and ensure all persons with disability achieve their full potential and play an

active part in nation-building. This is why the recent decision to drop questions related to disability from the sixth National Family Health Survey (NFHS), scheduled to begin on July 1, 2023, is inexplicable. The NFHS, conducted every three years, collects data on a gamut of development indices vital to inform policy and programmes.

This survey, which covers approximately seven lakh households across the country, is an important tool to gather data on whether people with disabilities have access to basic amenities and other govern-

ment programmes. However, at a time when the need to ensure no one gets left behind is doubly important considering the ravages caused by Covid, the exclusion of questions on disability is an opportunity lost to gather disaggregated disability data.

## **An Opportunity Lost**

According to the Disability Rights India Foundation (DRIF), a non-profit working for disability rights, disability disaggregated data is the cornerstone for disability-relevant services. Instead of sharp-

ening its questionnaire related to disability, NFHS has reversed the process by removing disability-related questions

Considering that India is a signatory to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), this regressive move contradicts its principle of "leaving no one behind" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. In India, PwDs experience an average loss of 10-17 years in life expectancy. Creating pathways to change this and make health services disability inclusive requires access to comprehensive health data which NFHS could have provided.

Children with disabilities are disadvantaged on most

measures of child well-being. In comparison to children without disabilities, children with disabilities are 24% less likely to receive early stimulation and responsive care; 42% less likely to have foundational reading and numeracy skills; 25% more likely to be wasted and 34% more likely to be stunted; 53% more likely to have symptoms of acute respiratory infection; 49% more likely to have never attended school; 32% more likely to face corporal punishment; 47% more likely to be out of primarv school, 33% more likely to be out of lower secondary school and 27% more likely to be out of upper secondary school; 51% more likely to feel unhappy and 41% likely to feel more discriminated against. Now consider the fact that

one-third of disabilities in children are preventable if detected early and empowered with timely interventions. A roadmap based on accurate data to reach about 20.42 lakh children in the 0-9 age group with some form of disabilities, either congenital or acquired, could be life-changing.

It is no secret that existing disparities were exacerbated by Covid. In the context of education, data shows that before the pandemic, more than 4.1 million girls were not going to school across India. The closure of 1.5 million schools during the pandemic impacted over 247 million children enrolled in elementary and secondary schools, including 37 million with disabilities.

A 2020 survey by Swabhiman, a community-

based organization working for the rights of persons with disability, in Odisha, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Tripura, Chennai, Sikkim, Nagaland, Haryana and J&K found about 43% of children with disabilities planned to drop out due to hardships in online education.

It is not just the lack of access to educational aids that impedes the well-being of a PwD. They have little or no access to health services as information about disease symptoms and prevention, is not provided in accessible formats such as print materials in Braille, sign language interpretation, captions, audio provisions and graphics.

Women with disabilities are doubly marginalised on account of their disability and

their gender and face greater social barriers, discrimination and isolation. Moreover, women and girls with disabilities are three times more likely to experience gender-based violence compared to non-disabled women.

The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, emphasises prevention of disability through appropriate awareness measures, investigation, and research. Article 31 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities mandates collection of appropriate information on PwDs to enable the formulation and implementation of policies. Can there be a better mechanism than the NFHS to gather data to understand the prevalence and pattern of disabilities?

# RBI's balance sheet grows 2.5% to Rs 63.45 lakh cr

The size of the Reserve Bank's balance sheet increased by 2.5 per cent for the year ended on March 31 to about Rs 63.45 lakh crore on higher income, as per the central bank's annual report released on Tuesday.

The balance sheet of the RBI plays a critical role in the functioning of the country's economy, largely reflecting the activities carried out in pursuance of its currency issue function as well as monetary policy and reserve management objectives.

## **India's growth momentum to continue**

The Reserve Bank on Tuesday said that India's growth momentum is likely to continue in 2023-24 even as it made a case for pushing structural reforms to deal with the geopolitical developments and also to achieve sustained growth in the medium-term. The Reserve Bank's annual report flagged slowing global growth, protracted geopolitical tensions and a possible upsurge in financial market volatility as possible downside risks to growth. The report notes that volatility has ebbed in global financial markets and risks to financial stability from the failure of banks in some advanced economies (AEs) in March 2023 have eased. Resolute policy actions have stemmed the tide of confidence runs for now."Amidst strong global headwinds, the Indian economy is expected to have recorded a growth of 7.0 per cent in real GDP in 2022-23," it said. A sustained recovery in discretionary spending, particularly in contact intensive services, restoration of consumer confidence, high festival season spending after two consecutive years of COVID-19 induced isolation and the government's thrust on capex provided impetus to the growth momentum.

# India extends US\$ 1 bn credit line to Sri Lanka

# Abhilash Thapliyal: Cannes has become a marketing place for celebrities now

Anurag Kahyap's Kennedy had recently received a sevenminutes standing ovation at the Cannes Film Festival. And so, The **Pioneer** interacts with actor **Abhilash** Thapliyal, who'll be next seen in the film. sharing his experience of being at the Cannes.

ctor Abhilash Thapliyal, who's starring in Kennedy — yes, the same movie that received a resounding response at the Cannes Film Festival this year— tells us exclusively how he wants to make it big in the industry, but only and only via resonating with audiences through

his craft. The inside sources tell us that our interviewee, despite trying everything, merely caught the attention of his director. Accordingly, what are we here for? For us, actors like Abhilash are still sustaining success and making an impact. Unexpectedly, for the actor, it was the very first time walking any red carpet in his life since hail-ing from Uttarakhand, and this ing from Uttarakhand, and this seemed like a final flourish for him, going international. "The only thing I hope for after receiving a sevenminute standing ovation at The Grand Lumiere Theatre is for my success to be a long call. When I was shooting for *Kennedy*, I had no idea that the film was going to go international. Neither did I have the idea that I'd be making a red carpet debut in my I'd be making a red carpet debut in my entire life! And then my red carpet debut will be a grand affair. So now, I never want to disappear from the big

So, as we all know, movies are a platform everyone wants to be associated with. The industry comes with a lot of perks. Therefore, "My director, Anurag Kashyap, has not just made violent movies; he has also made a film like *Manmarziyaan*. His genre of movies is just like his changgenre of movies is just like his changing moods! Now, what you want to remember Anurag Kashyap for is totally your call. But all-inclusive, I will call Anurag Kashyap a noir director only. I am still very obscure in this industry and don't have a labelia of control of the con choice of scripts. My inclination is only to work hard to be seen as a

prominent artist, that's all."

Talking about the film screened at the international film festival, Abhilash Thapliyal said, "After a resounding success at the international festival, I cannot still set my standards higher because that will be unfair to how I function as a person. I didn't have any ulterior motives with any of my movies. Most probably, the directors see the giallo quality in me, but I claim it to be my personal innocence. By default, I am a very virtuous man! And my approach is also very pure this way."

Giving us supernumerary information about the film festival, he imparts, "This specific film festival is way too magnificent. As far as I remember, the first time it was held was for artistic

achievements, but I have no idea how the times have changed. I had never been invited to a film festival ever in my life! But what I could see was that this place was actually becoming an international marketing place for our stars. My thought process tells me that it should be more about the rendezvous of films and less about fashion, but it's going in the opposite track. Cannes has the biggest theater there! Inside the theater, there are certain guidelines on how you have to dress appropriately, it's a formal affair as compared to what's happening outside. Even your feet should be covered! As soon as I entered the theater, I could see a black-and-white atmosphere. What else I observed when I came back to India was how the media was hardly talking about the films that were screened there, most of the limelight was taken by the actresses and what they wore. Nobody dis-cussed Martin Scorsese's film in detail! I don't understand this obsession

with fashion by our media?"

He continued, "There are many directors and producers that come there so that their ambition for storytelling is recognised. Even I got confined in this media discussion! But because I am from Uttarakhand, I played smart and took the statement pieces from my native state in anticipation of identification that I am an

Indian, specifically from a state called Uttarakhand. I took it into my stride! And in fact, the art form from my birthplace is actually dying — so this was a moment of recall. We were not so successful in drawing eyeballs with the cinema that was being screened there, the media was discussing the worth of the necklace piece worn by Miss Diva Universe. As it's been discussed, it's really true that biggies actually book the ticket, walk the red carpet, and then leave without even watching the film inside the theater. That's so uncool! You are wasting space. Each to its own — at least I wasn't there for a fashion parade. Fashion should be an extension of this festival, not the primary focus!"

Coming to an end, we hear, "My challenges in professional life were a little lesser in comparison to my personal life. The professional life has always been kind to me, but simultaneously, while doing all these movies, something else was going on in my personal life that took a toll on me. For example, when I was shooting for TVF example, when I was shooting for I VF Aspirants, I lost my father! Every day, my father was going through chemotherapy, and I had to make a career for myself as well. Immediately after that, my mother had to go through a major heart surgery, so my battles were like these. But all is well

# MEDVEDEV OUT OF FRENCH OPEN

rorld number two Daniil Medvedev was knocked out of the French Open in the first round on Tuesday, losing in five sets to 172nd-ranked Thiago Seyboth Wild of Brazil.

Seyboth Wild, who came through the qualifiers and had never previously won a Grand Slam match, tri-umphed 7-6 (7/5), 6-7 (6/8), 2-6, 6-3, 6-4. It was Medvedev's fifth loss in the opening round at Roland Garros in seven appearances.

"I have watched Daniil play in my junior years. It's a dream come true to beat these kinds of players on this court," said the 23-year-old Brazilian who unleashed 69 winners past the

"I just wanted to get my angles right, get to the net as much as possible and use my forehand as much as possible against his — I guess it worked pretty well." He added: "I was cramping in the second set and couldn't really serve the way I wanted to but I tried to play my best tennis. I'm really happy with the way I played."

Seyboth Wild, without a win on the main tour since February 2022, had squandered two set points which would have given him a two-sets lead. Medvedev made him pay, levelling

the tie and then claiming a double break in the third set. But the Brazilian hit back, a dou-

ble break of his own in the fourth set levelling the clash as a fractious Medvedev bickered with the crowd.

In the final set, Seyboth Wild twice saw breaks retrieved by the Russian before he finally backed up a third break with a hold for 5-3. He held his nerve to clinch the fourhour 15-minute match courtesy of two

giant forehands and will face either Guido Pella or Quentin Halys for a place in the last 32. Medvedev arrived in Paris buoyed by winning his first ever clay court title

for his fifth trophy of 2023. But he has endured a bitter-sweet relationship with the French Open, losing in the first round in his first four visits. He ended that streak with a run to the quarter-finals in 2021.

at the prestigious Italian Open last week

Alexander Zverev made a winning return to Roland Garros on Tuesday with a straight-sets win over Lloyd



Harris in the French Open first round, 12 months since suffering a serious ankle injury in the semi-finals.

The German had to retire injured from a dramatic last-four clash with Rafael Nadal last season after twisting his ankle and did not play again in 2022.

That match had already reached three hours and was locked at 6-6 in the second set after Nadal won a first-set tie-break when Zverev suffered torn ankle ligaments and had to be taken off Court Philippe Chatrier in a wheelchair.

Zverev, who was the third seed last year, is only seeded 22nd this time around after struggling to recapture his best form since returning to the ATP

But the former US Open finalist had enough to beat South African Harris 7-6 (8/6), 7-6 (7/0), 6-1.

"It's nice to be back. I've marked this day in bold on my calendar since last

year," Zverev said. "I was obviously very disappointed with how that tournament ended for me (last year).

"That's why I think I appreciate even more when I play in a full stadium and the crowd is behind me."

Zverev went out in the first round in 2017 and needed five sets to win his opening tie at Roland Garros in both 2019 and 2021.

"No (not happy with his performance). But I'm happy that I won in three sets. Normally I start with five-set matches so I'm happy to win in three." Zverev will next face Slovakia's Alex

# Van der Sar to quit as Ajax chief after 'tough period'

m ormer\,Netherlands\,goalkeep}$ er Edwin van der Sar on Tuesday announced that he was quitting as Ajax chief executive, after "an incredibly tough period" of more than a decade at the helm of the Amsterdam powerhouse.

Van der Sar's resignation comes on the back of the worst season in 14 years for the top Dutch club which finished third in the Eredivisie after a 3-1 drubbing by FC Twente on Sunday.

After almost 11 years on the board, I am done," Van der Sar, 52, said in a statement.

"We have experienced wonderful things together, but it has also been an incredibly tough period," the former Manchester United 'keeper said, who retired from professional football in 2011. Ajax have failed to qualify for the Champions League after finishing third in the Eredivisie behind Feyenoord and PSV Eindhoven.

Media reports including the NOS public broadcaster and daily tabloid De Telegraaf said supporters held Van der Sar responsible for the club's drop in success, following the departure of sporting director Marc Overmars and trainer Erik ten

Hag. Former Dutch international Overmars quit after admitting sending inappropriate messages to female staff at Ajax, while the successful Ten Hag left for Manchester United in April last

Van der Sar said he needed to "take some distance, to get some rest, and to do other things.

Ajax supervisory board chairman Pier Eringa said the club "wanted Edwin to stay, but he had made his decision. We have to respect that.'

Van der Sar's contract ran until June 30, 2025.

"The last season does not reflect the entire period that he has been in charge of Ajax, Eringa stressed.

Regarded as one of the world's all-time best goalkeepers, Van der Sar played for Ajax from 1990-1999, winning the Champions League in 1995.

He went on to lift the European Cup again in 2008 with Manchester United after spells at Juventus and Fulham.

Van der Sar returned to Ajax in 2012 as director of marketing before being promoted four years later to CEO. He is also the second-highest capped Netherlands player of all-time with 130 international appearances.


