Free grain to poor for five more years

The Union Cabinet, on Wednesday, decided to extend the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) to provide 5 kilograms of free food grains per month to 81.35 crore poor people for another five years, which would cost the exchequer ₹11.80 lakh crore. The Cabinet meeting, chaired

by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, also approved the Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan, which focuses on 11 critical interventions for Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups. Additionally, the Cabinet approved a central scheme to provide drones to 15,000 progressive women Self Help Groups (SHGs) with an outlay of ₹1,261 crore for two years

beginning in 2024-25." The Cabinet also cleared the Terms of Reference of the 16th Finance Commission to suggest the ratio for the devolution of taxes between the Centre and States. Additionally, it will review financing for disaster management initiatives for five years beginning April 1, 2026. Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Thakur told the media, "Keeping in view the welfare of the beneficiaries and to strengthen food security in terms of accessibility, afford-



ability, and availability of food grains for the targeted population, and to maintain uniformity across the States, the decision has been taken to continue providing food grains free of cost under the PMGKAY for five

The scheme was last extended until December 31, 2023. The PMGKAY was introduced in 2020 as a pandemic relief measure, providing 5 kg of free food grains per beneficiary per month, in addition to the 5 kg of subsidised food grain under the National Food Security Act (NFSA).

In December 2022, as the PMGKAY came to an end after multiple extensions, it was subsumed under the NFSA, providing ration for free for one year. Under the NFSA, two categories are covering up to 75 per cent of the rural population and 50 per cent of the urban population — Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) and priority households. AAY households, comprising the poorest of the poor, are entitled to receive 35 month, while priority households receive 5 kg per person per month.

Termed as a historic decision, the Government has stated that the extension of free grain distribution under the PMGKAY for the next five years reflects the long-term commitment and vision of the government in addressing national food and nutrition security. This move is expected to help mitigate any financial hardship faced by the affected strata of society in a sustainable manner and ensure a long-term pricing strategy with zero cost to the beneficiaries. This, according to a statement, is vital for the effective penetration of the Public Distribution System.

For example, the economic cost of 35 kg of rice for an Antyodaya family is ₹1,371, while the cost of 35 kg of wheat is ₹946. These costs are being borne by the Central Government. As a result, the monthly savings of ration cardholders are significant due to the provision of free food grains, it added.

Free grains will be distributed through a network of over 5 lakh fair price shops under a common logo. Beneficiaries can obtain their entitled grains from any fair price shop in the country under the One Nation One Ration Card initiative.

Global applause for Uttarkashi Rescuers Rat hole miners make India proud

Human labour triumphing over machinery. This is how the world media described the climax of an incredible and perilous weeks-long rescue operation for 41 construction workers trapped in a collapsed mountain tunnel Uttarakhand

As rescuers in India on Tuesday evening successfully pulled out all the workers after their 17day ordeal, the global media provided live coverage of the dramatic rescue operations. "In the end it was a triumph of human labour over machinery as the specialist rat-hole mining experts managed to manually break through the final 12 metres of rubble, using only hand drills and pulleys," The Guardian newspaper wrote.

The workers were pulled out through an escape pipe after the last stretch of rubble had been manually drilled by a specialist team of "rat-hole mining" experts who had been flown in to help after the mechanical drill broke down. The dramatic scenes of the first men emerging on stretchers from the entrance of the Silkyara-Barkot tunnel came after more than 400 hours, during which the rescue operation hit multiple obstacles, delays and false promises of imminent rescue, the British newspaper said in a detailed report.

"Outside the tunnel, there have been celebrations at the news of the first man coming out of the

They were freed after a mammoth rescue operation that overcame many obstacles, it

"This happy conclusion came after a day filled with anticipation, as authorities announced that there had been a breakthrough in the rescue operations," the British public broadcaster said.

Military engineers and miners drill 'rat hole' through debris to complete a painstaking extrac-

tion mission, said London-based daily 'The Telegraph' in its lead story.

A portion of the tunnel collapsed on November 12, blocking the exit for the workers who were inside. Food, medicines and other essentials were sent to them through a six-inch pipe pushed through the rubble of

the collapsed portion. So-called rat miners were brought in on Monday to drill through the rocks, gravel and metal obstacles by hand from inside a narrow evacuation pipe that pushed through the debris after machinery failed, France 24 reported. The New York Times in its

report said initial drilling efforts were hampered by additional falling debris. And by Day 13, the rescue effort appeared in disarray as an American-made auger machine broke down with less than 20 metres to go in the drilling. As workers tried to extricate it, officials initiated backup plans, including one in which workers began drilling vertically from the mountain-

New machines were flown in

from different parts of the country. But, in the end, the rescue effort — which also involved international tunnelling experts — found success in manual drilling by "rat hole miners" in the final stretch of the path that had been mostly cleared by the auger machine.

The rescue operation faced hiccups even in its final hours, threatening to derail the growing confidence of family members who waited in anticipation of their relatives being pulled to safety, it said.

SC upholds Centre call on India to probe plot to kill

 $I^{ ext{n a major setback to the AAP}}$ Government, the Supreme Court on Wednesday permitted the Centre to extend the tenure of Delhi Chief Secretary Naresh Kumar, a day before he November 30, for six months, holding that the Union Government's decision did not violate law or the Constitution.

A bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and justices IB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra held, prima facie, the Centre has the power to appoint and extend the tenure of the Chief Secretary of the national capital territory of Delhi as the officer deals with the entire administration including police, public order and land, which fall beyond the legislative and executive powers of the Delhi Government.

"We come to the conclusion that at this stage, bearing in mind the provisions of the judgment of this court in Constitution Bench 2 (2023 judgment on Centre-Delhi government services row) and the subsequent developments which have taken place resulting in the enactment of the amendment to the GNCTD Act 1991, the decision of the Union Government to extend the services of the incumbent



strued to be violative of law or the constitutional distribution of powers between the Union and the government of the GNCTD," the bench said.

The bid to extend the tenure of the present chief secretary is the latest bone of contention between the Arvind Kejriwal Government and Lieutenant Governor (LG) V K Saxena, who have been involved in a series of run-ins over various issues. Significantly, the current

chief secretary, whose tenure will now be extended, is reportedly not on good terms with the Delhi Government owing to allegations against his son in a case related to acquisition of 19 acres by the National Highways Authority of India in 2018 for construction of the

Dwarka Expressway. "It will be farfetched to postulate that the central government is divested of the power to appoint the chief secretary. We clarify that this is on the basis of a prima facie evaluation," the bench said.

Delhi CS tenure extension Khalistani terrorist in US

Tndia on Wednesday said it **⊥** has constituted a high-level enquiry committee to probe allegations relating to a conspiracy to kill Sikh extremist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun on

Announcing this here, the External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said India will take necessary follow-up action based on the findings of the committee.

The Financial Times, citing unnamed sources, last week reported that US authorities thwarted a plot to assassinate Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, and issued a warning to the Indian Government over concerns it was involved in the plot. Bagchi said India constituted a high-level inquiry committee on November 18 to look into all the relevant aspects of the matter.

Pannun, a Sikh extremist and known to be an American and Canadian citizen, is wanted by Indian probe agencies on var-

ious terror charges. "We have already said during the course of discussions with the US on bilateral security cooperation, the US side shared some inputs pertaining to nexus between organised criminals, gun runners, terrorists and oth-

"We had also indicated that India takes such inputs seriously since they impinge on our national security interests as well, and relevant departments were already examining the issue," he said.



Midair marital feud diverts flight to Delhi

Afight between a man and his wife midair compelled a Munich-Bangkok bound Lufthansa flight (LH772), which took off from Munich, to make an unscheduled landing at Delhi's Indira Gandhi International (IGI) airport on Wednesday morning. Subsequently, the couple was de-boarded.

According to sources, a German man and his Thai wife started fighting midair during the flight from Munich to Bangkok. Lufthansa first requested permission to land in Pakistan. When this was denied, the airline made an emergency stop in Delhi because of the unruly passengers. This is one of the very rare conditions where an interna-



tional flight had to be diverted not owing to some medical emergency or safety purpose but for a fight between a man and his wife that went too far. Sources said the wife had first complained about her husband's behaviour to the pilot, saying she was being "threatened" by him and sought intervention.

Sources said the 53-year

blanket using a lighter, shouted at his wife and did not follow the instructions issued by the crew" and hence the pilot diverted the flight. The man was later deboarded by Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) personnel at IGIA. The wife was travelling on a

different PNR ticket and she desired to continue her journey to Bangkok, they said. The airline, as per the sources, is also coordinating with the German Embassy. "The man of German nationality was offloaded at Delhi and handed over to airport security. He has since apologised," they added.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) is now mulling whether to consider the apology and allow the man German passenger allegedly to return to Germany, or hand



It rains in Bhopal, similar weather to prevail in Dec first week

eavy rainfall was witnessed in the evening on Wednesday in the state capital, another western disturbance would reach North India on November 30 due to this effect with the start of December month rainfall would occur in

Rainfall started once again in Bhopal on Wednesday evening. Earlier in the morning fog was witnessed and which remained till 11 in the morning. It was cloudy in the afternoon. It started raining in the evening. The day temperature in the cap-

ital reached 20.2 degrees. Usually the day temperature dips to this level in December-January, but this time the temperature fell in the last week of November itself and in the past 13 years it was the coldest November. However, due to humidity the night temperature has not dropped much.

The weather remained abrupt in Madhya Pradesh for the fourth consecutive day on Wednesday. In the morning there was dense fog in many districts including Indore, Bhopal, Sagar, Gwalior, Jabalpur. Visibility was also low. Rain started in Bhopal after 5 pm. Light rain also occurred in Umaria and Malajkhand of Balaghat district. It remained cloudy throughout the day in most cities.

There was a dense fog in the capital on Tuesday morning. Visibility 1200 meters from 5:30 to 9:30 in the morning. It was done. The day temperature was recorded at 25.7 degree celsius. It increased by 4.8 degree celsius as compared to Monday. Despite this it remained 2 degree celsius less than normal.

The increasing fog in North

India has started affecting traffic. Indigo's Delhi-Bhopal, Udaipur-Bhopal, Prayagraj-Bhopal flights arrived in Bhopal late by three and a quarter hours, while the Raipur-Bhopal flight arrived late by an hour. Railways also started Kalka-Sai Nagar Shirdi Express. Canceled till 2nd December.

Cold conditions have increased in many states, snowfall possible in Kashmir. It has rained in Delhi, Gujarat, Haryana, Punjab, UP and Maharashtra, due to which the cold has increased. Hail fell in some areas of eastern Rajasthan. There is a possibility of snowfall in Jammu-Kashmir and Uttarakhand for the next three days.

Indore was the coldest city in the state on Wednesday. The day temperature here reached 22.3 degrees Celsius. There was a drop of 1.7 degree celsius in a single day. There was a difference of 5.9 degree between day and night temperature in Indore. The temperature here was recorded at 16.4 degree celsius at night. The mercury was recorded at 22.9 degree celsius in Shajapur.

There was a drop of 2 degree celsius in Bhopal and the temperature reached 23.7 degree celsius. The temperature was 23 degree celsius in Ujjain, 23.8 degree celsius in Dhar, 23.6 degree celsius in Raisen, 23.2 degree celsius in Ratlam.

Senior meteorologist said that a new western disturbance will be active in the state from tonight. Due to this, the rainy season is expected to start again. It will rain the most in the Indore-Ujjain division.

On November 30, rain with lightning is expected in other districts including Dewas, Sehore, Shajapur, Dhar, Indore, Ujjain, Rajgarh, Bhopal. The weather will remain changed in the state on December 1 also.

The Meteorological Department has issued an alert of light to moderate rain in 12 districts including Bhopal, Jabalpur, Chhindwara in the next few hours. According to the Meteorological Department, light rain may occur at isolated places in Chhindwara, Narsinghpur, Bhopal, Bhimbetka of Raisen and Sanchi, Vidisha, North Betul, Sehore, Sagar, Damoh, Jabalpur, Umaria and Moderate rain with lightning is

likely to continue in Pachmarhi in Narmadapuram district.
Meteorologist said that there is a possibility of lightning during the activity of the system, hence an advisory has been issued. People should not stand under trees during thunderstorms.

12 kg silver idol of Lord Parshvanath stolen

A 12 kg silver idol of Lord Parshvanath was stolen from the Digambar Jain temple of Sukhi Sevaniya in Bhopal, in the night of Tuesday thieves entered the temple by breaking 5 locks.

They also took away 50 silver crowns (Chhatrs) and a box full of silver idols. The Ashtadhatu idol of Lord Adinath was also stolen. The total value of the stolen goods is around Rs 16 lakh. Digambar Jain Temple is in Ahimsa Sthali Colony of Sukhi Sewania. This colony is close to the railway station. On Wednesday morning, the police and FSL team went to the temple and investigated. The thieves have been revealed in the CCTV footage. Police have registered an FIR on the complaint of temple general secretary Mukesh Jain.

This is the second incident of theft in Digambar Jain temple in Bhopal in 3 days. Earlier on Sunday night, miscreants had stolen the idol of Lord Parshvanath by breaking the lock of the sanctum sanctorum of Panch Balayati Digambar Jain temple in Neelbad. This idol of Ashtadhatu is about 7 inches high and weighs 8 kg. Mukesh Jain told that the campus of Ahimsa Sthali Colony is completely covered. The thieves cut the mesh on the boundary wall after this, 5 locks on the

were broken. CCTV footage showed that they entered the temple at 2.28 am. A silver idol weighing 12 kg, an Ashtadhatu idol of Lord Adinath, 50 silver umbrellas and 8 auras

were stolen. Also took a locker. Many silver idols were kept in it.

The thieves also tried to break away the safe full of cash. After failing, they came out of the temple at 2.44 am and ran away. Three thieves had entered the temple while two of their accomplices are believed to be standing outside to keep watch. Police also suspect that an outside gang may be involved in the incident.

At present the construction work of the temple is going on, hence the deity was consecrated in a nearby room for the darshan of the devotees. Police estimate that there were more than one miscreants and they had come by car. This is because in the CCTV footage, a car is seen stopping at a short distance from the temple at night.

Expecting higher price, C'garh farmers halt selling paddy

Anticipating higher paddy price when a new government is formed in Chhattisgarh, farmers have stopped selling their paddy crops in the state.

Although no political party has said whether it will provide the promised higher price from the current crop season, the farmers have decided to wait for the electoral outcome on December 3.

The paddy procurement at MSP began in the state on November 1. Between November 1 and 28, about 13.21 lakh tonnes of paddy were purchased from 3,17,223 farmers, which is less than the quantity procured in the last Kharif season in the state.

In the previous Kharif season (2022-23), 5.42 lakh farmers sold 19.3 lakh tonnes of paddy from November 1 to 29. The state has set a target to buy 130 lakh tonnes of paddy during the current Kharif marketing season and set up 2,739 procurement centres.

The procurement drive will continue till January 31. Around 26.87 lakh farmers have registered to sell their



produce this time. The Congress government had

been buying paddy at MSP

and giving an input subsidy of Rs 9,000 per acre to paddy

It had hiked the limit of purchase from 15 quintals per acre to 20 quintals per acre for

the ongoing Kharif season.
The Congress promised that farmers will get Rs 3,200 per quintal for paddy if it retains power in the state.

Why India lags in organ donation

Cocietal reservations, lack of Sawareness infrastructure are the major roadblocks for active organ donations in India, according to health experts on Wednesday.

India faces the lowest donation rate worldwide, with a mere 0.1 per cent of the population donating their organs after death in stark contrast to 70-80 per cent in Western countries.

"Currently there is a huge gap between patients who need organs and the actual available for organs transplantation. The waiting list for kidneys and liver can go up to several years. The heart and lung recipients are completely dependent on cadaveric organ donation programme, hence it is imperative that we as a country pledge for this cause," Rahul Pandit, Chair, Critical Care, Sir H N Reliance Hospital, Foundation Mumbai, told IANS.

Traditionally concepts have been practiced in India, live related donation cadaveric organ and donation, he explained.

Live related donation involves removing a healthy organ usually from recipients near relatives as described in the organ donation Act and transplanting it in the recipient. However, this practice is only limited to kidney and liver in solid organ transplantation.

Cadaveric donation is organ donation after brain stem death. This is possible in patients who have an irreversible neurological condition, who are on a ventilator in ICU with no brain function.

This process, if the family consents then almost 8-9 organs -- cornea, heart, lungs, 2 kidneys, liver, pancreatic islets cells, uterus, both hands, skin, bone and muscle tendons -- can be donated,

the doctor said. "While there has been a slight improvement in harvesting organs from



deceased donors, with an increase in the average number of transplants per donor, it remains insufficient. For example, out of 12,387 harvested organs in 2021,

only slightly over 14 per cent were from deceased donors," Yasir Rizvi, Associate Director & Senior Consultant - Nephrology at Dharamshila Narayana Superspeciality

Hospital, told IANS.

Rajesh Aggarwal, Chief and Sr. Consultant - Kidney Transplant & Dialysis Department at Sri Balaji Action Medical Institute,

explained that "myths surrounding brain death contribute to considerable organ wastage, with India losing around 2 lakh kidneys and other vital organs

Properly harvesting even 5-10 per cent of all brain deaths for organ donation could render the need for living donors obsolete. The particularly pronounced in heart transplants, with challenges like cost and expertise availability in different cities exacerbating the problem.

"India faces a critical challenge with a dismal organ donation rate of 0.86 per million people, necessitating a drastic improvement. Despite a notable post-Covid resurgence in transplant activities, achieving over 15,000 transplants in 2022 with a 27 per cent annual increase, societal reservations remain a significant obstacle. The country grapples with a demand-supply gap in organ donation and transplants due to a lack of awareness and deep-rooted superstitions," Aggarwal told IANS.

Rizvi also noted limited awareness and infrastructure as a significant challenge in organ donation in India.

exists a substantial gap between organ demand and supply, with only 0.1 per cent of the population donating their organs after death, he

"The situation demands urgent action, given the organ shortage crisis in the country. Public awareness campaigns are crucial to enhance organ donation rates, and collaboration between the medical fraternity and policymakers is necessary to streamline donation processes.

"Establishing transparent organ registries and strengthening deceased donation organ infrastructure are pivotal steps for India to advance in organ donation and transplantation," he said.

To boost organ donation practices, the health experts called for a comprehensive approach. Education campaigns can debunk myths and emphasise the impact of donations on saving lives, they said.

1,500 km of train route gets Kavach

ailway Minister Ashwini Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw on Wednesday said the indigenously-developed automatic train protection system 'Kavach' has been fully installed on 1,500 km of train route and a significant progress has been made to increase its coverage.

"We started our journey with the Kavach system in 2016 and till 2020, its pilot work, testing, modification and version enhancement were done. It was in the beginning of 2022, its production and installation started on a large scale," Vaishnaw said during an interaction with media.

"Today, we have installed the system on 1,500-km route and a significant progress has been made (for its installation) on another 3,000-km route on the Mumbai-Howrah and the Delhi-Howrah route," he said.

'Kavach' is an automatic train protection system for enhancing safety of running trains. It has been developed indigenously by the Research Design and Standards Organisation (RDSO) in association with three Indian vendors.

'Kavach' not only helps loco pilots to avoid signal passing at danger and over-speeding but also helps in train running during inclement weather such as dense fog, leading to enhanced safety and efficiency of train operations.

Some features of the system are controlling speed of trains by automatic application of brakes in case loco pilot fails to apply the brakes and repeating lineside signal in cab which is very useful for higher speeds.

Vaishnaw said that with continuous efforts, the railways has made a significant capacity enhancement to install 'Kavach' on 1,500-km route every year. Elaborating about the system,

Technology solution for Geospatial domain

ndia will soon have a Centre of **▲**Excellence to foster the Geospatial Innovation & Research and to cater to emerging technology solution requirements of the Geospatial domain in the country.

A tripartite MoU was signed in this regard between National Geospatial Programme- DST, National Institute of Geo-informatics Science & Technology (NIGST), Survey of India, and IIT Tirupati Navishk?r I-Hub Foundation on Wednesday to establish this Centre of Excellencea Pilot.

The Geospatial Innovation & Research Centre of Excellence (CoE) as a pilot aims to cater for the emerging technology solution requirements of the Geospatial domain in

the country. The Centre would support and encourage innovative geospatial technology-based startups, industries, Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) that have an application and impact in the core sectors of the economy.

Professor Abhay Karandikar, Secretary, DST highlighted that this is perhaps the first step in the direction of implementing some aspects of the National Geospatial Policy. "After liberalising the Geospatial Guidelines and bringing in the Policy, we are in the process of reforming the Survey of India. There is a plan to set up a geospatial data exchange. Incubators will also be set up to work both on developing the geospatial technology as well as support startups that can focus on applications," he added. Professor Karandikar pointed out



that geospatial data science is an emerging interdisciplinary field which includes geospatial engineering, computer science and information technology. Boosting pollination to improve crop yield

 $P^{\text{lanting flowers such as marigold}}_{\text{and red gram beside food crops}}$ on farms in India has been found to attract bees and consequently boosts pollination and improves crop yield and quality, researchers have said. The first Indian study of its kind

undertaken in the Kannivadi region of South India's Tamil Nadu in 24 moringa orchards is published in the Journal of Applied Ecology and was carried out by ecologists from the University of Reading, UK, and the MS Swaminathan Research Foundation, India. The scientists worked with small-

holder farmers and helped them plant red gram and marigold besides the Moringa crop. Moringa crop is a nutrient-rich "superfood," and its essential pollinators are

The research team increased the abundance and diversity of flowervisiting insects, ultimately improving pollination and boosting crop

Dr Deepa Senapathi, of the University of Reading, said: "Planting wildflowers on agricultural land is a tried and tested method seen in many arable fields and orchards in the UK and across Europe. This farming technique is known to boost insect pollinator



We worked with farmers in South India to design the best co-flowering crops and boost the numbers of native bees and other insect pollinators visiting the moringa

orchards. They helped them plant red gram and marigold flowers in 12 orchards while the other 12 had no co-flowering crops planted in them.

Flower visitor numbers and diversity were 50% and 33% higher in sites with red gram and marigold flowers compared to those without. Sites with higher numbers of flower visiting insects also showed better quality of crops, with bigger moringa pods. The sites with red gram and marigold flowers which had previously suffered from a lack of pollination saw higher yields. Numbers of harvestable moringa fruits increased by 30% in the orchards with co-flowering crops, compared to those without. "Greater yields and higher quality fruit will translate to a healthier and better food supply for smallholder communities. The farming com-

munities can also use the red gram

as a protein source in their diets and

receive extra income from selling

the marigold flowers." The study was produced as part of the TROPICAL project, led by the University of Reading team using UKRI funding from the Global Challenges Research Fund to investigate how research evidence from the UK could be used in tropical landscapes where pollinator dependent crops are grown.

India has many crops of high economic and nutritional value, such as mango and moringa, where there is potential to significantly increase and improve crop pollination services. Intensive farming practices, using large amounts of chemical pesticides and fertilisers, and loss of natural habitats have negatively impacted biodiversity in India including native bees and other pollinators, said the researchers. Since smallholder farmers in the

tropics, whose crops depend on native pollinators, are particularly vulnerable to these impacts, the study results show how farmers can boost yields while also managing their lands in a more sustainable

Out, with lessons

The evacuation of 41 workers tells us a few things about what went right and what we must set right

ife be frail and ephemeral but it is the human grit, determination, resilience and collaborative spirit that makes it explore space, navigate seas, move earth, climb mountains and challenge the mighty Nature. On the same theme, the Silkyara tunnel rescue operation in Uttarkashi stands out as a shining example of effective crisis management. After 400 hours of intense effort, the trapped workers can see the sun again. It was arguably the nation's biggest rescue operation – international experts, local authorities, Army and big machines all worked in tandem to pull off this feat. And the rat miners, part of the Army operations, deserve a special mention as finally they managed to reach the miners after digging continuously for 24 hours. Rat mining is now banned in India, yet their skills did the trick. Celebrations apart, this is also the time to ponder over the lessons learned from the oversights and mistakes made during the mission. For 17 days, the Silkyara-Barkot tunnel became a site of frenzy after 41 workers were trapped

in the tunnel. The rugged terrain and inclement weather compounded the challenges; the remote location added a degree of difficulty to the mission, necessitating a swift and coordinated response.

While the rescue operation ultimately succeeded, it is important to examine our shortcomings to improve future crisis responses. One notable oversight was the initial delay in deploying specialised equipment to the site. This lapse, attributed to logistical challenges and communication gaps, underscored the importance of a rapid and efficient response in emergencies. Another lesson learned was the need for enhanced coordination among the agencies involved in the res-

cue. Effective communication channels and seamless collaboration are essential for streamlining efforts and ensuring a cohesive response. It would have been better had the Army been called in earlier, given its expertise in such operations. Initially, delays and confusion arose due to inadequate coordination, highlighting the need for improved inter-agency cooperation which was, however, made good after it became a national top story. While the operation showcased the prowess of specialised units in handling complex crises, it also emphasised the importance of addressing logistical challenges and improving coordination among agencies. It also highlighted how protocols and standard working procedures are flouted by the companies involved. There must be a Government agency to ensure that safety procedures are followed. The life of every individual matters but the companies often cut corners when it comes to worker safety. Even the multinational companies operating in India do not follow the same safety protocols they follow in Europe and America, as was amply proved by the Bhopal gas disaster. They know safety at the workplace is not a priority. In Silkyara, there was no plan in place to evacuate workers in case of an emergency. By continuously refining our emergency response strategies, we can better prepare for challenges.

Tunnel between science and spirituality RAJDEEP PATHAK




The successful rescue mission in the Silkyara, shows how coordinated efforts and a compassionate approach can achieve the impossible

he march of science, the heart of man must beat in unison with the heart of God. The future belongs to spirituality over science, to metaphysics over physics. These profound words of Swami Vivekananda gripped my attention after a friend of mine shared it on my WhatsApp with a photograph of tunnelling expert Arnold Dix bowing down before God (read Almighty) outside the Silkyara tunnel.

The successful completion of the rescue mission to extricate 41 workers trapped inside the Silkyara tunnel on Uttarakhand's Char Dham route was achieved on Tuesday evening of November 28, 2023. Rat-hole mining experts employed manual drilling techniques to navigate through the final 10-12-meter stretch of debris from the collapsed section of the under-construction tunnel. It was on the morning of Diwali, November 12, that a landslide occurred at approximately 5:30 AM, causing a section of the Silkyara-Dandalgaon tunnel under construction on the Brahmakal-Yamunotri highway at Uttarkashi to collapse.

The tunnel, a critical part of the Char Dham all-weather road project led to the trapping of 41 workers inside the tunnel, specifically at the Silkyara Bend -Barkot tunnel, situated about 200 meters from its entrance, which triggered a challenging rescue operation, as the entire nation joined in unison praying for the safe exit of the trapped workers. Action by officials and district administration began immediately and meticulously to bring out the trapped workers unhurt. Twelve skilled rat-hole mining experts played a crucial role in this intricate operation.

The successful rescue operation in the Silkyara tunnel – after the 17-day ordeal of life and death involved a collaborative effort from various entities, including the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) at the national level, state rescue agencies, international drilling experts, and even local rat-mining labourers - whose crucial contribution had often been overlooked by many. The district administration swift-



After the release of the 41 trapped workers, in a message, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that their "courage and patience" was inspiring. In a post on 'X', he wrote, "I want to say to the friends who were trapped in the tunnel that your courage and patience is inspiring for everyone. I wish you all well and good health. It is a matter of great satisfaction that, after a long wait, our friends will now meet their loved ones."

Mediators look to extend truce in Gaza on its final day

International mediators worked on Wednesday to extend the truce in Gaza, hoping the territory's Hamas rulers will keep freeing hostages in return for the release of Palestinian prisoners and further respite from Israel's air and ground offensive. It will otherwise expire within a day. Israel has welcomed the release of has welcomed the release of dozens of hostages in recent days and says it will maintain the truce if Hamas keeps freeing captives. But its other major goal — the annihilation of the armed group that has ruled Gaza for 16 years — could be Gaza for 16 years — could be slipping out of reach.

Weeks of heavy aerial bombardment and a ground invasion have demolished vast swathes of northern Gaza and killed thousands of Palestinians. But it seems to have had little effect on Hamas' rule, evidenced by its ability to conduct complex negotiations, enforce the cease-fire among other armed groups, and orchestrate the smooth release of hostages.

Hamas' leader in Gaza, Yehya Sinwar, and other commanders have likely relocated to the south, along with hundreds of thousands of displaced Palestinians who have packed into overflowing shel-

An Israeli ground inva-sion of the south could even-tually ferret out Hamas' leaders and demolish the rest of its militant infrastructure, including kilometres of tunnels, but at a cost in Palestinian lives and destruction that the United States, Israel's main ally, seems unwilling to bear.

The Biden administration has told Israel that if it resumes with far greater precision, especially in the south. That approach is unlikely to bring Hamas to its knees any time soon, and international pressure for a lasting cease-fire is

already mounting.

"How far both sides will be prepared to go in trading hostages and prisoners for the pause is about to be tested, but the pressures and incentives for both to stick with it are at the moment stronger than the incentives to go back to war," Martin Indyk, a former US ambassador to Israel, wrote

Burns and David Barnea, who heads Israel's Mossad spy agency, were in Qatar on Tuesday to discuss extending the cease-fire and releasing more hostages. Qatar has played a key role in mediating with Hamas, hosted the talks, which also included Egyptian

A joint statement from foreign ministers of the G7 group of wealthy democracies, which includes close allies of Israel, called for the "further extension of the pause" and for "protecting civilians and compliance with international law."

The war began with Hamas' October 7 attack into southern Israel, in which it killed over 1,200 people, mostly civilians. The militants dragged some 240 people back into Gaza, including babies, children, women, soldiers, older adults and Thai farm labourers. Israel responded with a devastating air campaign

across Gaza and a ground invasion in the north. More than 13,300 Palestinians have been killed, roughly two-thirds of them women and minors, according to the Health Ministry in Hamas-ruled Gaza, which does not differentiate between civilians and com-

Israel says 77 of its soldiers have been killed in the ground offensive, and it claims to have killed thousands of militants, without providing evidence.

The plight of the captives, and the lingering shock from the October 7 attack, has galvanised Israeli support for the war. But Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu is also under intense pressure to bring the hostages home, and could

find it difficult to resume the offensive if there's a prospect for more releases.

Hamas is still believed to be holding around 150 hostages — enough to extend the ceasefire for another two weeks under the current arrangement of releasing 10 each day. But it is expected to drive a harder bargain for the release of Israeli soldiers, likely demanding the release of Palestinian prisoners convicted of deadly attacks.

TWELVE MORE HOSTAGES FREED

In the latest swap, nine women and a teenager, as well as two Thai nationals, were freed on Tuesday and returned to Israel. The 17-year-old girl could be seen walking alongside Hamas militants to a waiting Red Cross Jeep with her small, white-haired dog named Bella. Soon after, Israel released 30 Palestinian prisoners.

After being extended by one day, the truce is due to end after one more exchange on Wednesday night.

A total of 60 Israelis have been freed as part of the truce, most of whom appear physically well but shaken. Another 21 hostages — 19 Thais, one Filipino and one Russian-Israeli — have been released in separate negotiations since the truce began. Before the truce, Hamas released four hostages, and the Israeli army rescued one. Two other hostages were found dead in Gaza. The latest swap

Palestinian women and teenagers freed from Israeli

Most have been teenagers accused of throwing stones and firebombs during confrontations with Israeli forces.

Several were women convicted by Israeli military courts of attempting deadly attacks. Palestinians have celebrated the release of people they see as having resisted Israel's decadeslong military occupation of lands they want for a future

TENSE CALM IN GAZA

The cease-fire has brought calm to Gaza and increased deliveries of humanitarian aid, allowing people to stock up on food, water and fuel after weeks of severe shortages. Some have been able to sift through the rubble of their homes and bury relatives, but Israel has barred people from returning

On Tuesday, Israel and Hamas blamed each other for a brief exchange of fire in northern Gaza, but it did not appear to endanger the truce. Palestinian militants have halted rocket fire into Israel, as has Lebanon's Hezbollah, which had repeatedly traded fire with Israeli forces along the northern border since the start of the war. Israel's bombardment and ground offensive have displaced more than 1.8 million people inside Gaza, nearly 80 per cent of the territory's population, and most have sought refuge in the south, according to the UN. The cease-fire has allowed increased aid delivered by 160 to 200 trucks a day into Gaza, but that is less than half what Gaza was importing before the fighting, even as

Blinken heads again to Middle East

Antony Blinken says the Biden administration would like to see a new extension of the ceasefire agreement in Israel's war with Hamas after the current one expires to secure the release of additional hostages held by the militant group and to ramp up humanitarian aid deliveries to

As he prepared to make his third visit to the Middle East since the war began with Hamas' Oct. 7 attacks in Israel, Blinken said Wednesday that in addition to discussing short-term logistical and operational planning, the Biden administration believes it is imperative to discuss ideas about the future governance of Gaza if Israel achieves its stated goal of eradicating Hamas.

Israel and Arab nations have resisted such discussions about future governance, with Israeli officials concentrating on the war and Arab leaders insisting the immediate priority must be ending the fighting that has killed thousands of Palestinian civil-

The extension of the current deal expires later Wednesday. "Looking at the next couple of days, we'll be focused on doing what we can to extend the pause so we can continue to get more hostages out and more human-itarian assistance in," Blinken told reporters in Brussels, where he was attending a NATO foreign ministers meeting. "And we'll discuss with Israel how it can achieve its objective of ensuring that the terrorist attacks of Oct. 7 never happen again, while sustaining and increasing human-

itarian assistance and minimizing further suffering of alestinian civilians."

He added before leaving Brussels for Israel and the West Bank: "Everyone's focused on the day of, on what's happening in Gaza right now, but we also need to be focused at the same time and we are in conversations with many other countries — on what I call the day after' and the day after the day after': I mean,

what happens in Gaza once the campaign is over?" Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has made clear that Israeli forces will eventually restart military operations after the conclusion of the current, temporary cease-fire that has allowed for an exchange of hostages taken by Hamas for Palestinian prisoners held by

US President Joe Biden has said he would like to see the pause continue for as long as feasible. Biden and Blinken have also stressed the importance of planning for post-conflict Gaza as well as the need to resume negotiations for the eventual creation of an independent Palestinian state. Netanyahu is opposed to a Palestinian state and has said he is the only Israeli leader who can prevent one

from being formed.

"We believe that that is the only path to enduring peace, to enduring security, to the preservation of Israel as a strong secure, democratic Jewish state and Palestinians having their legitimate aspirations for a state and self determination," Blinken

Donald Trump has embraced the rioters who attacked the US Capitol on January 6, 2021 as patriots, vowed to pardon a large portion of them if he wins a second term and even collaborated on a song with a group of jailed defendants. In his election interference

case in Washington, his lawyers are taking a different tack. Despite losing a bid to strike from the indictment references to that day's violence, defence attorneys have made clear their strategy involves distancing the former president from the horde of rioters, whom they describe as "independent actors at the Capitol." At the same time, special counsel Jack Smith's team has

signalled it will make the case that Trump is responsible for the chaos that unfolded, and point to Trump's continued support of the January 6 defendants to help establish his criminal intent. The competing arguments highlight the extent to which the riot serves as an inescapable backdrop in a landmark trial set to begin on March 4 in a courthouse just blocks away from the Capitol. It also reflects a point of separation between Trump and his legal team in the case accusing the front-runner for the Republican presidential nomination of conspiring to overturn his 2020 election loss. While Trump's glorification of January 6 defendants may boost him politically as he vies to retake the White House in 2024, his lawyers'

approach lays bare a concern that arguments linking him to the rioters could harm him in front of a jury. Though Trump is not charged with inciting the riot, any success he hopes to have at trial may turn in part on his defence team's ability to neutralise, or at least minimise, the ghoulish images of the violence that prosecutors cite as a natural extension of the former president's repeated lies about a stolen election.

Much may depend as well on the evidence permitted by US District Judge Tanya Chutkan. Trump's lawyers have signalled they will try to block prosecutors from presenting at trial evidence related to the actions of the rioters, who sent lawmakers running into hiding.

Pope Francis presided at his weekly audience with the public at the Vatican, but he said that he's still unwell and asked an aide to read his remarks for him on Wednesday, a day after cancelling an overseas trip. Francis, who will turn 87 on December 17 and had part of one lung removed as a young man, coughed near the end of the hourlong audience in a Vatican auditorium as he made some final comments, then stood up from his chair on the stage to give his blessing. With a soft voice, barely above a whisper, Francis told the public that "since I am not well," his reading of his speech wouldn't sound "pretty." He then hand-

Imran not to contest for PTI chairman's post

Nominates close aide to lead party

Tailed former prime minister Imran Khan will not contest the organisational polls of his party and has instead nominated his close aide Gohar Khan for the post of Pakis-tan Tehreek-e-Insaf chairman to lead the party in the upcoming general elections, a top leader said on Wednesday. Barrister Ali Zafar said

that Chairman Imran Khan would not be contesting intraparty polls scheduled for December 2 due to his legal problems, hence Barrister Gohar Khan had been nominated for the slot of the party chairmanship in a temporary arrangement. Imran Khan had been convicted in the Toshakhana case.

His statement comes a day after confusion erupted within Imran Khan's party after it dismissed a statement by one of its own senior leaders, who claimed that the jailed leader would not contest for the chairman's post in the upcoming intra-party polls.

"Imran Khan was, is and will continue to be the chairman of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf... I will carry out my responsibility till Khan returns," said Gohar Khan, a member of PTI chairman's legal team.

Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) is set to conduct intraparty elections within the 20day time frame set by the election commission to retain the 'bat' as its electoral symbol, ahead of general elections scheduled to be held on February 8.The party was asked by the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) last week to hold polls within 20 days or it would be deprived of its election symbol of cricket bat. Zafar said that the party discussed the issue of election with Imran Khan who said that he did not want to give the ECP any "excuse" for not giv-



ing the party the bat symbol in the upcoming general elec-

tions.
"The public is with us. We will win the elections when they happen. I want to take part in the general election. Întra-party polls hold no meaning for me. I want the Toshkahana case to be decided as soon as possible. When it is decided, I will contest intra-party polls as chairman," Zafar quoted Imran Khan as saying. The ex-premier also directed the party to hold intra-party polls while making it clear that he would not contest intra-party polls until the Toshakhana case was decided.

'With his (Gohar Khan) nomination, you will realise that this is not a minus-one formula, that this is not a coup. He is Imran Khan sahib's own nominee and is appropriate for the temporary arrangement we are doing," Zafar said. He also said that the new chairman would be a "caretaker chairman" and work on a temporary basis until Khan was re-elected as head of the party after his acquittal. He further said that PTI and Imran Khan were synonymous.

"PTI is İmran Khan and Imran Khan is PTI. PTI is nothing without Imran Khan. It doesn't matter if you're the chairman on paper. The leader, and the continuous leader, is Imran Khan sahib," he added.

Khan has been in jail since Aug 5 when he was arrested after a conviction in the Toshakhana case. He was also disqualified by the ECP in the same case for failing to disclose the proceeds from the sale of gifts he got from the state

The party's Core Committee on Monday gave formal approval to hold the intra-party polls within the time frame of 20 days given by the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP). If the party does not follow the orders, it will lose its bat symbol.

Khan, being a former iconic international cricketer, is considered synonymous with the (cricket) bat.

This will be a huge development for the party as the country moves towards general elections, set to take place in

Meanwhile, Sessions court udge Muhammad Mureed Abbas on Wednesday rejected Imran Khan's request for acquittal in the intimidation of a female judge case.

The former prime minister was booked under terrorism charges in August 2022 at Margalla police station in the federal capital for his remarks at a rally in F9 Park where he warned Additional District and Sessions Judge Zeba Chaudhry and police high-ups of dire consequences for their "biased" attitude towards his party. However, after personally visiting Judge Zeba at an Islamabad lower court to apologise last year, Imran Khan had submitted an affidavit to the Islamabad High Court, assuring that he would not repeat actions that would hurt the dignity of the judiciary.



May 9 violence was an attempt to topple Army Chief: Ex-Pak PM

Pakistan's former prime minister Shehbaz Sharif said on Wednesday that the unprecedented violence, including the attacks on key military installations, following ex-premier Imran Khan's arrest in May was an attempt to topple Army Chief Gen Asim Munir. The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz [PML-N] party President made the remarks while addressing reporters after his appearance in the accountability court here in a corrup-

Taking an indirect dig at the 71-year-old Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party chief Khan, who is in jail in the cipher case, for trying to topple the incumbent army chief through a planned conspiracy on May 9, Sharif said the facilitators of the unprecedented attacks are the "state enemies".

"On May 9, an attempt was made to topple the army chief. No one...be it (a) democracy or



dictatorship tolerates treason. Thereby, the action is being taken against the May 9 culprits," Sharif, 72, said.

Sharif further said no concession should be given to the facilitators of May 9 as they were "state enemies". Thousands of PTI sup-

porters stormed military and government installations across the country following Khan's arrest in an alleged corruption case in early May this year. Subsequently, police arrested over 10,000 party leaders and workers, who have been languishing in jail since then.

The military also took allowing Khan's party to partic-

dozen high-ranking officers for being part of the conspiracy to oust Gen Munir.

Three officers, including a lieutenan-general, have been removed from their jobs. Strict disciplinary proceedings against officers, including three major generals and seven brigadiers, have been completed in connection with the May 9 incidents," the military had said earlier. The PML-N party has declared Khan the mastermind of the attacks on military installations and demanded that the "PTI leadership involved in this crime should not be allowed to contest upcoming general elections on February 8, 2024."

Xi goes on inspection tour of Shanghai

Thinese President Xi Jinping on Wednesday inspected key commercial establishments in Shanghai, home to some of the biggest foreign firms, as he attempted to shore up business confidence in China amid dwindling inflow of foreign investment and the movement of supply chains out of the country. This is his first visit to Shanghai since the city was hit hard by COVID-19 leading to the harsh two-month-long lockdown in 2022 during which its 25 million population was confined to their dwellings under Xi's 'zero COVID' policy. He visited the gleaming eastern Chinese city last in 2021. Xi, 70, in the last two days, inspected the Shanghai Futures Exchange, an exhibition on Shanghai's sci-tech innovations, and a government-subsidised

rental housing community, learning about the city's efforts in strengthening its competitiveness as an international financial centre, state-run Xinhua news agency reported. His visit was aimed at building the city into an international sci-tech innovation centre, and constructing government-subsidised rental housing projects, it said.

Shanghai is the home for top foreign firms like Tesla, General Motors, Walt Disney and the 10year-old Shanghai Free-Trade Zone (FTZ), a testing ground for China's economic reforms.

Since, 2021, the world's second-largest economy has been hit hard by recurring and prolonged lockdowns of various cities which exacerbated China's economic woes, denting the business confidence including its once-booming property sector. Xi's first visit came close on his successful visit to the US this

month where he had a "strategic and historic" summit with US President Joe Biden during which the two leaders agreed to tone down their harsh policies and rhetoric against each other. While their summit sparked speculation of a subtle shift in

Russian court extends detention of Wall Street Journal reporter

AP MOSCOW

court in Moscow has of Wall Street Journal reporter Evan Gershkovich, arrested on espionage charges, until January 30, Russian news agencies reported. The hearing took place behind closed doors on Tuesday because authorities say details of the criminal case against the American journalist are clas-

Gershkovich, 32, was detained in March while on a reporting trip to the Russian city of Yekaterinburg, about 2,000 kilometres (1,200 miles) east of Moscow. Russia's Federal Security Service alleged that the reporter, "acting on the instructions of the American side, collected information constituting a state secret about the activities of one of the enterprises of the Russian military-industrial complex".

Gershkovich and the Journal deny the allegations and the US government has declared him to be wrongfully detained. Russian authorities haven't detailed any evidence to support the espionage charges. Gershkovich is the first American reporter to be charged with espionage in Russia since 1986, when Nicholas Daniloff, a Moscow correspondent for US News and World Report, was arrested by the KGB. He is being held at Moscow's Lefortovo prison, notorious for its harsh conditions. Analysts have pointed out

that Moscow may be using jailed Americans as bargaining chips after US-Russian tensions soared when Russia sent troops into Ukraine. At least two US citizens arrested in Russia in recent years including WNBA star Brittney Griner – have been exchanged for Russians jailed in the US.

The Russian Foreign Ministry has said it will consider a swap for Gershkovich only after a verdict in his trial. In Russia, espionage trials can last for more than a year.

NZ leader plans to ban cellphone use in schools

Wellington (AP): New Zealand's new prime minister plans to ban cellphone use in schools and repeal tobacco controls in the ambitious agenda he released on Wednesday for his first 100

days in office. Christopher Luxon outlined 49 actions he said his conservative government intended to take over the next three months. The first new law he planned to pass would narrow the central bank's mandate to focus purely on keeping inflation in check, he said. That would change the Reserve Bank's current dual focus on low inflation and high employ-

Many of the actions in the 100-day plan involve repealing initiatives from the previous liberal government, which had been in office for six years. The new efforts include a plan to double renewable

energy production. Luxon said many of the measures were aimed at improving the economy. Many of the plans are proving contentious, including the one to repeal tobacco restrictions approved last year by the previous government. Those included requirements for low nicotine levels in cigarettes, fewer retailers and a lifetime ban for youth.

Luxon's government has said that ending the tobacco restrictions — which were not due to take effect until next year — would bring in more tax dollars, although Luxon said Wednesday it wasn't a case of trading health for



The government has cleared the Terms of Reference of the 16th Finance Commission to suggest the ratio for devolution of taxes between the Centre and states and also review financing disaster management initiatives, for five years beginning April 1, 2026. The commission would submit its report for the five-year period (2026-27 to 2030-31) to the President by October 31, 2025, an official statement said. Besides tax devolution and states' revenue augmentation measures, the commission would review the present arrangements for financing disaster management initiatives with reference to the funds constituted under the Disaster Management Act,

The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved the Terms of Reference for the Sixteenth Finance Commission. The 16th Finance Commission's recommendations, upon acceptance by the government, would cover a period of five years commencing April 1, 2026," the statement said.

The Cabinet meeting was held on Tuesday.

Names of the chairperson and members of 16th Finance Commission would be finalised soon, an official said. The Terms of Reference (ToR) for 16th Finance Commission will be notified in due course.


Player of the match Patil admitted India made errors in the field.

him with all the support needed for sustained success at the international level," the BCCI secretary said in a statement. 'The last two years with Team

India have been thoroughly memorable. Together, we have witnessed the highs and lows, and throughout this journey, the support and camaraderie with-
