All 41 workers rescued from collapsed Silkyara tunnel

All involved in rescue work created an example of humanity: PM

Rescue workers pulled out all 41 workers trapped in Uttarakhand's Silkyara tunnel in a multi-agency rescue operation that hovered between hope and despair for almost 17 days. Union Minister V K Singh and Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami welcomed the workers as National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) men brought them out through a steel chute that lined a 60-metre passage.

An ambulance with the first of the 41 workers left the mouth of the tun-41 workers left the mouth of the tun-nel around 8 pm, about an hour after a group of rat-hole mining experts dug through the last stretch of rub-ble. There was hugging and cheers as the ordeal ended. Outside the tun-nel some people chanted "Har Har Mahadev" and "Bharat Mata ki Jai" Ambulances which had lined up at Ambulances which had lined up at the tunnel ferried the workers to a community health centre where a special 41-bed ward had been set up. Before this, the workers were given a quick medical checkup as

they emerged out of the steel pipe. CM Dhami said no worker was in a critical situation. But the labourers will be kept under medical observation for some time

said the youngest of the worker was rescued first. A portion of the tunnel on the Char Dham route collapsed on November 12, blocking the exit of the workers who were inside. Food, medicines and other essentials were sent to them through a six-inch pipe pushed through the rubble of the collapsed portion. Relief was felt far and wide. Over the phone, Jharkhand's Sunil, who was camping in Silkyara, said on the res-

"Finally, God heard us. My brother could be rescued. I am with him in an ambulance on the way to hospital," he said in a choked voice.

He launched 12 sub-stations built with a cost of Rs. 620crore in Alluri Sitarama Raju, Sri Saya Sai, Eluru, Palnadu, Néllore, Annamayya and Kadapa districts and the laid foundation stone for 16 sub-stations in Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Visakhapatnam, Anakapalli, Kakinada, East Godavari, Dr BR Ambedkar Konaseema, West Godavari, Guntur, Prakasam, Nandyala and Kurnool districts being

built with a cost of Rs 2479 crore. The solar power projects with an investment of Rs. 3400 crore at the solar parks at Kadapa and Anantapur will have an employment potential for 1700 persons.



Addressing a press conference, Chief Electoral Officer Vikas Raj said, "It is 5 pm and the. silent period has started. There are various restrictions that are put in place by the Election Commission of India. In the last 48 hours, basically tranquil period given to the voters to mull over things and come to a conclusion.

The model code of conduct came into force in the state after the Elections Commission announced the schedule on October 9. There are 3.26 crore eligible voters in the state.

ment of sports and games. Principal Secretary PS

Pradyumna of the Youth Advancement, Tourism, and Culture (Sports and Youth issued Services) G.O.Ms.No.26 with immediate effect in this regard on Tuesday. The government has also rescinded the earlier G.O.Ms.No.1.

According to the government order, the initiative aims to establish a more efficient delivery system and effective administration of sports at the district level. Presently, Youth Services Chief Executive Officers (CEO) at the district level oversee sports activities. With the new initiative, STEP CEOs will focus solely on youth services, while DSDOs will assume responsibility for sports and games at the district The decision to demerge

On November 20, the Andhra Pradesh High Court granted bail to Naidu while noting that the discretion to grant bail should be exercised judiciously in a humane and compassionate manner. The TDP chief recently underwent cataract surgery at L V Prasad Hospital in Hyderabad. He was arrested on September 9 and released on interim medical bail on October 31,

The Chief Minister also laid the foundation stone for enhancing the production capacity of EV scooter manufacturing utility of Avera AI Mobility Pvt Ltd's plant at Nunna in Vijayawada from 25,000 to 1 lakh units. The enhanced production capacity will provide employment to another 200 persons. With the new sub-stations across the State, supply, and transmission capacity would be upgraded and most of the power problems would be solved, said the Chief Minister, adding that people in submergible Mandals like Kunavaram, Chintur, VR Puram, and Etipaka would also receive quality power.

He said that the Government had spent Rs 1700 crore in the initial days to enhance the feeder capacity to supply nine-hour free power to farmers during the day.

The Chief Minister said that the Government

has also signed an agreement with SECI (Solar Energy Corporation of India) for producing 17,000 million units of solar power in the State and supplying 13,000 million units of power to the agricultural sector at the rate of Rs. 2.49 per unit as against the usual average unit cost of Rs. 5.30 thereby reducing the burden of the State exchequer on free power supply to farmers.

He said the SECI would make available 3000MW, 3000MW, and 1000 MW of solar power by Sept 2024, Sept 2025, and Sept 2026 respectively. These violations pose a significant risk to public health, necessitating immediate action by the

In an especially alarming incident, officials at Helapuri Restaurant, situated at Jagadamba Junction, discov-



ered rotten meat being prepared for sale. This revelation raised serious concerns about the restaurant's commitment to food safety, resulting in its immediate closure. The restaurant's owner is now facing legal action for compromising public health. Furthermore,

authorities found evidence of pests in the kitchen of Zee Shan Restaurant in Madhurawada, underscoring the gravity of food safety lapses. The confirmed presence of pests prompted the issuance of a stern warning to the establish-

At the end of the day, the Congress is under compulsion to get a majority on its own, without hoping for support from outside. What if the CPI is an alliance partner of Congress? And, what difference will it make if CPI gets say one of the two seats it is contesting. If Jana Sena Party headed by film actor Pawan Kalyan manages to win two or three seats (out of the 8 seats it is contesting in alliance with BJP), there is no guarantee that JSP would offer support to BRS even on the advice of its alliance partner. It would be interesting to

watch whether BRS would uphold democratic norms should it not have the required numbers to form the government with or without the support of BJP and MIM. If BRS does achieve a hat-trick against odds, and not in disregard of democratic norms, KCR would indeed become a towering personality on the nation's southern political screen.

New lease of life for baby with acute leukemia

A two-year-old baby was given a new lease of life by the doctors of American Oncology Institute (AOI) in Kanuru, Vijayawada. He had been diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL).

The baby was presented with complaints of persistent fever and breathlessness. The initial evaluations revealed an alarmingly high white blood cell count (WBC), low platelet count, and anaemia, sparking immediate concern. Further diagnostic tests, including bone marrow studies, confirmed a high-risk diagnosis of Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia, a form of blood cancer that primarily affects children. Under the expert guidance of

Dr Sai Krishna Kolluru, Medical Oncologist, the baby was promptly admitted to the intensive care unit (ICU) and a rigorous course of treatment was started. Over the span of three months, the baby was under intensive chemotherapy, administered by the highly specialised team at AOI Vijayawada, all the while under close monitoring to manage and mitigate the sideeffects and complications associated with such a demanding treatment protocol.

In an astonishing turn of events, within just one month of dedicated treatment, the disease was under control, leading to complete remission. The child has now successfully completed the treatment.

Police rescue 18 tourists struck in Odisha's nature camp

Ready to collaborate for building Indian space station: NASA

he United States is open to collaborating with India in building its own space station, National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) Administrator Bill Nelson said here on Tuesday. On a visit to India, Nelson said the US and India were working on plans to send an Indian astronaut to the International Space Station by the end of next year. "The selection of astronaut is determined by ISRO. NASA will not make the selection," Nelson told a group of reporters here. In response to a question,

he said the US would be ready to collaborate with India in building the space station if it so desires. "We expect by that time to have a commercial space station. I think India wants to have a commercial space station by 2040. If India wants us to collaborate with them, of course, we will be available. But that's up to India, Nelson said. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has asked ISRO to aim to build an Indian space station by 2035 and land astronauts on the moon by 2040.



Delhi court seeks ED's reply on Sanjay Singh's bail plea by Dec 6

The judge also directed the ED to provide

a copy of the reply to the accused. The application, filed by the accused on November 24, has claimed that he is no longer required for custodial interrogation and that no purpose will be served by keeping him in custody. It claimed that the investigation against Singh was complete and there was no chance of tampering with evidence or influencing witnesses. Singh, who is currently in judicial custody, also claimed in the application that he was ready to abide by any condition imposed by the court.



Prez: Cost of justice, language impede equal access to justice

President Droupadi Murmu on Tuesday said the "cost" and the use of Énglish language in the higher judiciary are among the hindrances in the way of equal access to justice, and emphasised on their removal.

Addressing a conference here, she emphasised on the need to launch an awareness campaign among people, living in rural areas and those from socially disadvantaged groups, to help them make them conscious of their rights and get legal assistance.

Murmu said, equality is not only the foundation of justice, but a necessary condition of it too. "It has been long since the world proclaimed that all human beings are equal, but we need to ask ourselves if we all have equal access to justice,"

In practice, it means some people are often unable to seek redressal of their griev-

ances due to several factors, the

president said.

"Our principal task is to remove those obstacles. The chief obstacle, of course, is often the cost of justice," Murmu said, addressing the valedictory session of the first regional conference on 'Ensuring Access to Quality Legal Aid for the Vulnerable: Challenges and Opportunities in the Global South' here.



Delhi Court acquits 9 accused of arson, vandalism

A court here has acquitted nine accused people of all charges, including rioting, vandalism, and arson, during the 2020 Delhi riots, saying they were entitled to the benefit of the doubt.

Additional Sessions Judge Pulastya Pramachala was hearing a case against the accused, who were accused of being a part of a riotous mob that torched a godown and some vehicles in Shiv Vihar here during the communal riots on February 25.

Noting the evidence before it, the court said the incident of vandalism and arson at the godown was established.

The court underlined that

the prosecution's case hinged on the testimonies of two police officials, an assistant sub-inspector (ASI), and a head constable (HC).

It said the ASI mentioned the names of the accused, on the plea that he had known them since before the alleged incident. But later the police official said that he only knew the names of three accused

"Forgetting a fact is much different from wrongly asserting a fact. Without having knowledge of a fact, one cannot assert it, and on the other hand, despite having knowledge of a fact, one can forget it and may come up with a wrong description of such a fact," the court said.

As per official data for seizures made by the state police, out of the total Rs 436 crore, cash comprised Rs 47 crore, liquor valued at Rs 39 crore and nar-cotics of Rs 87 crore were intercepted since the model code of conduct was implemented by the EC on October 9.

RRTS project: Want complete compliance of order, SC to Delhi govt PNS NEW DELHI

The Supreme Court on Tuesday made it clear that there can be no partial compliance of its order directing the Delhi government to release funds for the Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) project and complete compliance of its directions must take place according to the schedule.

Current solar cycle intensity to peak in 2024

■ May impact Earth's satellites, find researchers

PNS NEW DELHI

The current ongoing solar cycle is likely to peak its intensity in 2024 and can potentially impact Earth's space weather, according to researchers at the Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), Kolkata.

It is known that roughly every 11 years, the intensity of solar activity reaches its peak, which manifests as violent disturbances in space weather such as solar magnetic storms or coronal mass ejections, impacting Earth's satellites and telecommunications.

"During intense solar storms, the Earth's upper atmosphere expands outwards, thereby introducing friction on the low-Earth satellites. The friction can lead to a decay in the satellites' orbits and reduce their lifetime. Thus, they are able to live in space for a much shorter time than they were originally supposed to," Dibyendu Nandy, the study's corresponding author and



Professor of Physics and Head, Center of Excellence in Space Sciences India, IISER, Kolkata,

The researchers also said that the most intense of these storms can cause serious dam-

age to orbiting satellites, electric power grids and telecommunications when directed at Earth. In their study appearing in the journal Monthly Notices of

the Royal Astronomical Society Letters, the researchers discovered a new relationship to help predict the occurrence of peaks in solar cycles, which are produced by an internal dynamo mechanism, harnessing energy from plasma flows inside the Sun.

Using decades-old data archives from ground-based solar observatories worldwide, they found that the ongoing solar cycle 25 is related to the Sun's magnetism activity, which they said manifests as sunspots cycle and recycling of the large-scale solar dipole magnetic

The sunspots, or dark spots on the Sun, are comparable to the size of the Earth and their magnetism intensity is about 10,000 times stronger than the Earth's magnetic

Give peace a chance!

The extended cease-fire in Gaza is a fine opportunity to reach stability in the region

he cease-fire has come as a godsend to the average Palestinian who finally got respite from flying mortar shells and some peace to get ration and medicines, which are luxuries in the conflict zone. The two-day extension of the cease-fire offers them a glimmer of hope and to international community the time to work backchannels for prolonged peace. However, as the Hamas and Israel have tentatively agreed to a break from hostilities, questions linger about the long-term prospects for stability. Will these additional two days lead to meaningful negotiations and a lasting peace, or is it merely a temporary pause before the bloody conflict resumes? The international community plays a crucial role in determining the trajectory of events and fostering an environment conducive to sustainable peace. The decision to extend the ceasefire by two days suggests a willingness on the part of both Hamas and Israel to explore avenues other than bombs, bullets and bloodshed. This respite provides an oppor-



tunity for de-escalation and opens a window for negotiations. However, the history of conflicts in the region raises scepticism about the durability of such agreements. The cease-fire extension allows for humanitarian efforts to take place, facilitating the delivery of essential supplies and medical assistance to those affected by the violence. Additionally, the pause in hostilities can pave the way for diplomatic initiatives, fostering an environment where both parties can address underlying issues through dialogue.

One of the bigger, though not direct, consequences of the Gaza conflict is the involvement of super powers in the fray. Now that the US and the West are with

Israel, China and Russia are throwing their weight behind the Hamas. This could have ominous consequences for the world; it is, therefore, in the interest of the world and not just of the people of Israel and Palestine that this conflict is made to peter out, at least for the time being. Key stakeholders, including the United Nations, regional powers and other influential nations, should actively encourage both parties to engage in meaningful negotiations, addressing the core issues that fuel the conflict. The international community should work collaboratively to ensure the delivery of aid, medical assistance and reconstruction support to alleviate the suffering of those caught in the crossfire. To prevent a return to square one after the ceasefire extension, sustained diplomatic efforts are required. The extension of the Gaza ceasefire provides a fleeting moment of hope for peace, but the international community must remain vigilant in guiding the path forward. By actively supporting diplomatic initiatives, addressing humanitarian needs and encouraging sustained dialogue, the world community can play a crucial role in ushering in lasting stability in the region. The alternative resuming hostilities — would only perpetuate the cycle of violence and deepen the suffering of those directly affected by the conflict.

Nepal in the throes of strategic choices

epal is recovering from its long annual hangover after celebrating Dussehra and Ťihar. It energises Nepal to face the winter and the new year Vikram Samvat 2080 but with one-third of Nepal in India and abroad with 1500 youth leaving Nepal every day. The rising standards of living and consumption are visible to me who has seen Nepal almost annually since 1959. Still, people are rich or very poor with the middle class small. People are happy except for the victims of the dengue and Jajarkot earthquake. Nepalese are happy with so little. When piped water, electricity, schools and hospitals reached the valleys or near the road network, people descended from the hills to avail manmade facilities, forfeiting nature's gifts to the hills. Hastily carved unmetalled roads have scarred the hills polluting the environment. Scooters, cars, motorbikes, trucks, tractors...anything with an engine moves along dusty tracks. Some people began returning to the hills. Last week Kathmandu news was

dominated by one man: businessman- politician and expelled from CPN UML, Durga Prasain. He threatened to bring into Kathmandu 10 lakh protesters to rally against former PM and CPN UML chief, KP Oli. He is facing legal action for bad debt on loans taken from state banks. The debt, he says, will be repaid when he is solvent. Prasian has roped in King Gyanendra who is patiently waiting in the distant hope that monarchy will be restored. The mood in the country for the return of loyalty is growing given the pathetic track record of the secular, federal, democratic republic of Nepal. It was the Prachanda-led decadelong Maoist civil war that dismantled the monarchy in 2008 which was ratified by the 2015 constitution. Gyanendra attendd a Prasain-organised function in East Nepal at which he said: "We never wanted Nepal to become a republic that sends 10 mn youth to the Gulf countries". Gyanendra is on a tight leash from the state although his

he latest country report on Tuberculosis (TB) indicates that in India, women account for 39.1% of the total cases notified. But missing from these figures are the hundreds of women who remain undetected and uncounted.

Why do women report fewer cases of TB than men? The lack of agency, poorer access to healthcare services, household responsibilities and the stigma associated with TB prevent women from coming forward to seek treatment. FIRST COLUMN GOD HAS ALL THE POWER

If we want highest qualities, we must become devotees of God

oes it sound unfair? Think about it. Imagine one of us even with a little power. We are inclined to abuse it, especially if there is no fear of punishment. These examples will substantiate. What do despots do? They bring unimaginable pain and suffering to the citizens. What do corrupt policemen do? They victimise the victim, if he is a rich man; they exploit him. What does a bully in a school do? There are innumerable such examples. We, human beings, are incapable of handling

The creation works on the principle of 'karmaphala', which is, "What you sow you reap." Suppose God did not keep all the powers with Himself, what can someone do with an atom bomb? He can kill innumerable innocent citizens, who don't deserve to die according to their karmaphalas. Don't we have free will? So God had to balance between allowing free will and controlling all actions by everyone in order that the creation can go on. Parallel powers are unworkable. the setting sun's light. As a result, there was daylight and Jayadratha came out from the protection of Kauravas; Arjuna killed him. Similarly, the Lord says that the heat of fire is from Him. (7.9) So, what happened when Seetaji entered fire in her fire test? She came out unscathed, because the heat of fire was withdrawn by Lord Rama. Another famous example is of Ashwathama using 'Brahmastra' on child Parikshit, who was at that time in the womb of his mother Uttara. What did Lord Krishna do? He simply made Brahmastra harmless by withdrawing its enormous power? He could because nothing is independently powerful, neither a person nor a weapon. If this was not so, there will be parallel power, which cannot be allowed, as this can cause disruption in the creation's functioning.

Before I go any further in describing God's unlimited powers, a question must be answered, which is, "Why does God not stop miseries heaped by a strong person on the weak? Does God not have such a power? He does but allows it. Why? Because we suffer due to our karmaphal. Others are just acting as mediums. In those cases, God remains aloof. Continuing about the extent of Lord's powers, Lord Krishna says that He is manliness of men (7.8), which is a traditional quality of being brave and strong. In the verse #7.11, the Lord repeats this by stating that he is the strength of strong. However, in this verse, the Lord qualifies it by stating that such persons should be devoid of lust and attachment. If they are not, God will withdraw it from them. What happened to the most powerful man because of his lusty behaviour? I am referring to the last US President. Same could be said about Swami Vivekananda, whose brightness impressed one and all, wherever he travelled in the world. Where did this devotee of the highest order get his brightness? From God of course! I can go on, but the message is loud and clear. If we want the highest qualities, we must become devotees of God, otherwise we will always be inferior; God is ready to bestow upon us whatever is cherished by us. 'China slows, India grows'

S&P pegs 7% GDP growth for India by 2026

PNS NEW DELHI

India's GDP growth rate will rise to 7 per cent by 2026 compared to 4.6 per cent for China, S&P Global Ratings said on Tuesday.

In a report titled 'China Slows India Grows', S&P said it expects Asia-Pacific's growth engine to shift from China to South and Southeast Asia.

"We project China's GDP growth to slow to 4.6 per cent in 2024 (2023: 5.4 per cent), edge up to 4.8 per cent in 2025, and return to 4.6 per cent in 2026. We see India reaching 7.0 per cent in 2026; Vietnam, 6.8 per cent (4.9 per cent); Philippines (6.4 per cent); and Indonesia remaining

steady at 5 per cent," S&P said. The US-based rating agency on Monday projected India's GDP to expand at 6.4 per cent in the current fiscal year and in the next. For 2025 it projected growth rate to rise to 6.9 per cent, followed by 7 per cent in 2026. S&P said with Asia-Pacific's central banks likely to keep interest rates high, the region's borrowers will see costlier debt servicing.

'We lowered our projection for the region's growth (ex-China) in 2024 from 4.4 per cent to 4.2 per cent. The prospects for industries also differ, with export-centric manufacturing faring worse," S&P said.

The buyback, where investors can sell to the company their shares at an offer price of Rs 4,150 apiece, will close on December 7, TCS said in a regulatory filing on Tuesday. The information technology bellwether is aiming to repurchase up to 4.09 crore shares (1.12 per cent of the total equity share capital) at Rs 4,150 apiece in a buyback valued at Rs 17,000 crore.

For small shareholders, as defined by those with investments less than Rs 2 lakh, the entitlement ratio has been fixed at 1 share for every 6 shares held on the record date of November 25. For other qualifying shareholders, the entitlement ratio is set at 2 shares for every 209 shares held.

The company believes that the buyback is not likely to cause any material impact on the profitability or earnings of the company except to the extent of reduction in the amount available for investment, which the



company could have otherwise deployed towards generating investment income," TCS said.
"The company believes that

the buyback will not impact the growth opportunities of the company," it added.

Tata Sons Private Ltd, which holds 26.45 crore of 72.27 per cent of TCS, intends to tender 2.96 crore equity shares. Tata Investment Corporation Ltd intends to tender 11,358 shares out of 10,14,172 crore shares it holds in the company.

The total buyback size is 4,09,63,855 shares.

Assuming the response to the buyback is to the extent of 100 per cent from all the shareholders up to their entitlement, the aggregate shareholding of the promoters will increase to 72.41 per cent as against 72.3 per cent





In an exclusive interaction with The Pioneer, the CEO of Paani Foundation describes, "Climate change and the environmental crisis are the biggest challenges that humans are facing as a species, no matter what our profession is or which part of the world we live in. The festival engages with this crisis through films now! Joining the jury gave me an opportunity to engage with the most important question of our times via a medium I love."

Basically, he understood how environmental issues have proven themselves to be an increasingly hot subject in film and television. With access to a wide range of environmentally themed documentaries or movies, it might be overwhelming for him too. And so, he says, "Films give a face, a voice, and an image that has far greater impact than cold facts. The films in this festival will enhance anyone's understanding of environmental issues! Ultimately, change comes about when a large number of people are motivated to solve a problem. An initiative like this can serve as a trigger for more people to engage with the climate crisis. Change obviously comes through the action that might come out of it. There is no substitute for that actual work?

If you are searching for entertainment and educational content at the same time, this is the festival to be: "Many films were extremely moving. Some that I can recall are We are Guardians set in the Amazon rain forest, Haulout, From Dreams to Dust set in Indonesia, No Water, No Village set in Ladakh, and Tiger Army set in the Sunderbans. What I understood was that the global climate crisis threatens the existence of humans as a species. We are also in the process of destroying hundreds, if not thousands, of other species. We are presently looking at climate change as just another prob-lem, whereas it is the elephant in the room. If we are unable to arrest the pace at which the climate changes, we are all going to face catastrophic consequences in our lifetimes. I am not sure that our response is even remotely commensurate with the scale of the crisis. Like millions of others around the globe, I try and do the small things that would reduce my carbon footprint, but bearing in mind the scale of the crisis, these are far too small to mention."

In fact, he suggested, "We should not allow the noise to distract from the conversation. Because the crisis is far bigger than activists, conferences, and facades! It is an existential crisis, and finger-pointing is not going to help solve it. Nobody actually occupies the moral high ground here. As a species, we have failed Mother Earth. We are now in grave danger of failing ourselves."

From old to new, there were the best environmental films covering climate change, food waste, water ecosystems, the animal industry, and sustainability. So, as the festival's jury, he will lend his support to bringing sustainability and storytelling together.

It's never too late to save yourself from hair-thinning Hair thinning or hair loss can be caused by many different factors, including both controllable and uncontrollable

circumstances. According to NHS(UK) statistics, around 50% of women over the age of 65 experience hair loss or hair thinning, and two-thirds of all men are affected.

Although it's a common issue - and usually nothing to worry about – thinning hair can be a difficult and upsetting process emotionally, impacting both our confidence and

Rob Smith, Senior Principal Hair Care Scientist, at Dyson, gives a breakdown of the causes of hair thinning and effective ways to combat it.

HAIR GROWTH

The four phases of the hair growth cycle:

- Anagen: which lasts two to eight years. This first phase of the cycle is where hair is actively growing. The cells in the root of the hair add to the hair shaft. At any time, 80-90% of the hairs on a head are in the anagen phase. • Catagen: usually four to six weeks long, the catagen phase is a short phase that occurs at the end of the anagen phase. The hair strand detaches from its blood supply.
- Telogen: lasts two to three months when the hair is neither growing nor falling out.
 • Exogen: happens when the hair sheds and falls out, which can last two to five months. On average, people lose between 50 to 150 hairs each day.

CAUSES OF HAIR LOSS

Thinning hair can occur for many different reasons. Age and stage of life can affect our health hugely and cause a change in the condition of our scalp. These include:

- **Pregnancy:** During the second and third trimesters of pregnancy, the number of hairs in the active growth phase, known as anagen, increases. After the birth, hormonal changes can lead to follicles moving to the catagen or telogen states, resulting in post-pregnancy hair
- Emotional stress: A sustained level of emotional stress after a serious life event, such as bereavement, can cause hair follicles to shift from the growing phase to the resting phase.6 After two to three months, this can often become more noticeable, even if it is temporary, with more hair thinning and fall out.



- Getting older: Many people experience hair thinning during the ageing process. The rate of hair growth slows as your body ages, and each hair strand becomes smaller with less pigmentation – which is why people begin to develop grey hair.
- Illness: Thinning hair and hair loss can happen during illness. One such effect is an autoimmune condition called alopecia areata, a disease that develops when the body's immune system attacks the hair follicles as part of its defense system, causing hair loss. This can happen anywhere on the body. Thinning hair and hair loss can occur during treatment for illness too. The main example includes cancer treatment, specifically during chemotherapy.
- Hereditary hair loss: One established reason for hair loss is genetics, where hair loss isn't the result of a disease, but a natural combination of hereditary genes, hormone levels, and the aging process.
- Hormonal effects: The hair cycle and hair follicle structure are highly affected by various hormones. These include androgens such as testosterone, sex hormones such as estradiol, and thyroid hormones such as thyroxin and cortisol which are released by the adrenal glands as a stress response.

Losing hair can be a difficult experience. Hair loss and thinning can stem from many

different reasons, often exacerbated by lifestyle factors including high stress levels, an unbalanced diet, iron deficiency, and sudden weight loss. But there are some things you can do. To maintain healthy, steady, and effective hair growth, it's important to prevent hair thinning from an early age.

- Eating a healthy and balanced diet. Staying active reduces stress and stimulates
- endorphins.
- Embracing relaxation techniques such as meditation and massage. • Improving the balance of your work and
- personal life. • If you are suffering from dietary or health deficiencies then the use of supplements can have a benefit on hair growth, but not all do
- so. In fact, in some cases consuming too much Vitamin E or Selenium can have the effect of actually increasing hair loss. If you're interested in which shampoo or

hair thinning treatment to use, the first step is trying to identify the source of the prob-lem, to establish why your hair is shedding or falling out. There are many shampoos that claim to reduce hair thinning and promote hair thickness, as well as improve the shine and the general appearance of your hair. It's important to research the formulas and check the science behind them. Caffeine for example has a growing body of evidence14 in promoting hair growth.

There are also scalp treatments available,

one of the more common actives recommended being topically applied Minoxidil15, which has been shown to increase hair density for some conditions. It is worth mentioning however that even proven treatments don't work

Can hair grow back after thinning or bald-

In many cases, hair thinning can be resolved or improved by a variety of techniques already mentioned above.

However, if the hair follicle has stopped producing any new hair strands over a long period of time, new hair is unlikely to grow there especially if the underlying causes remain.

HOW TO MAKE HAIR LOOK THICKER

If your hair continues to thin, there are a range of options to consider that can help hair appear thicker and fuller, some of these can be quite invasive so make sure you understand the risks and benefits. These

- Blow drying hair in an upward motion
- Wigs and artificial hairpieces • Hair transplants
- Light therapy • Tattooing your hairline

HIDE THINNING HAIR AT THE FRONT

Creating an illusion of thicker hair and fuller volume can also be an effective way of approaching the loss, especially if you're trying to preserve your self-confidence.

Hair care products such as styling mousses can help add volume and body to your hair, supporting you to feel more confident. Creating a middle parting to drape hair over both sides of your face will help to create the illusion of fuller hair. A similar technique, used by salon professionals, is to add layers to your hair to add volume and provide definition. Airwrap multi-styler, supersonic, corrale, and others can help you create different styles, without using extreme heat.

HAIR THINNING IS NORMAL

Hair thinning can be a difficult process to go through, but it is a natural part of life. Depending on the reason for your hair loss and thinning, there are many ways to slow the process and preserve your hair. It is worth talking with a Trichologist for advice in finding a solution that works for you as an individual.

Offspinner Glenn Phillips claimed 4-37 in only his second match as New Zealand reduced Bangladesh to 310-9 on day one of the opening test on

Phillips' haul helped the visitors gain an edge after Bangladesh won the toss and opted to bat for batting. Bangladesh made a good start with opener Mahmudul Hasan playing serenely to put the side in the driving seat in the first session but his teammates' rash shots undermined his effort. Mahmudul made a team-best 86 off 166 balls with 11 boundaries. He shared stands of 39 for the first wicket with Zakir Hasan and 53 for the second with Naimul Hossain Shanto as Bangladesh made steady progress.

Shanto, who led the home team in the absence of Shakib Al Hasan, was dismissed just before lunch after playing an attacking 37 off 35 deliveries.

He was particularly harsh on left-arm spinner Ajaz Patel (2-76), hitting him for three sixes to entertain the sparse crowd. Patel, one of only three bowlers ever to take 10 wickets in a single test innings, gave the visitors an early breakthrough when he dismissed Zakir Hasan for 12 in the 13th over with a delivery that turned sharply to rattle the

Shanto targeted Patel and opened with a six over mid-on.

And he used his feet effectively to dominate New Zealand's other spinners — Ish Sodhi and Glenn Phillips. But he paid for his aggressive batting when he charged a full toss from Philips and skied a catch to Kane Williamson in the deep, making

the score 92-2. Mahmudul and Mominul dug in to defy the New Zealand attack and Mahmudul raised his fourth test fifty, driving Patel for a boundary through cover off 93

As the innings seemed to turn in Bangladesh's favour, Phillips made the crucial breakthrough when Mominul's attempted cut resulted in a catch behind the wicket, ending the 88-run partnership. Mominul scored 37 off 78 with four fours.

Mahmudul fell in the next over. After playing with soft hands throughout his stay, he went after legspinner Shodi, only to be caught by Daryl Mitchell at slip. With Bangladesh at 184-4, the onus was on veteran Mushfigur Rahim to lead the side but he needlessly charged Patel to be caught by Williamson at deep mid-off for 12.

Debutant Shahadat Hossain appeared to be solid against the spinners but the rash shots of Mehidy Hasan against pacer Kyle Jamieson (2-52), further deepened Bangladesh's crisis. Shahadat was undone by a slower delivery from Phillips as he chipped straight to short midwicket after adding 24.

The 1983 World Cup winning skipper said that the Indian fans should refrain from creating too much pressure and treat cricket just as anoth-

"Don't keep so much hopes that people end up with broken hearts. We need to keep a balance. Other teams also came to India to compete in the World Cup. We shouldn't create so much hype. We need to look at sports as sports only. Whoever plays good on the day, we need to respect that. We are too emotional," Kapil said on the sidelines of the inaugural tee off ceremony of Kapil Dev Grant Thornton Invitational golf tournament here.

India won 10 games, most of which were lopsided as contests, before Australia turned the tables on them at the Narendra Modi Stadium on November

For past 10 years, India have lost seven knock-out games out of eight ICC tournaments that they took part between 2014 to 2023. Kapil doesn't know if the pressure of occasion gets to them.

'I think today's players can answer how much pressure they feel. We can only feel," he said. However there are shortcomings which needs to be taken care of, Kapil stated, without specifying what they

"If they (India) win it feels really good. There are shortcomings which we need to address. It is not that you won't have shortcomings after a win. What's most important is to rectify them," the 63-yearold said.

He urged fans to celebrate what India achieved rather than what they missed out. "They (India) won 10 matches in a row. Is it not enough? We should look at other teams as well. We shouldn't compare anyone. What is important is to see whether they played good cricket or not.
