CM Rise School - an exemplary model of educational excellence

A unique initiative towards better implementation of the new education policy

adhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivrai LSingh Chouhan is committed to transforming government schools in the state. He believes that by mak ing government schools wellequipped and providing them with competent teachers, quality education can be imparted to students. These schools will foster better development of intellectual, mental, physical, emotional, and social skills in the students. The new education policy also emphasizes quality education and overall development, so every gov-ernment school in the state should aim to be an excellent institution.

While translating into reality the vision of Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, the Madhya Pradesh government has initiated a significant project - CM Rise School. The main objectives of this project are to determine replicable learning processes, maintain the learning outcomes of students, and create a high level of engagement between teachers and students. It aims to provide education in an interesting and enjoyable manner. CM Rise School will operate



from Grade KG to Grade 12. Under CM Rise School, a total of 9200 schools in the state are being equipped with all resources in two phases. In the first phase, 369 schools have been operated as CM Rise Schools, which include 274 schools from the School Education Department and 95 schools from the Tribal Affairs Department. Currently, an allocation of Rs. 8521.73 crores has been approved for the construction of 221 CM Rise School buildings. The construction work of 147 CM Rise School buildings has already begun. The construction of the first CM Rise School building in Gulana, Shajapur, has been completed. CM Rise School primarily focuses on strengthening the educational system and align-

ing students with socio-emotional skills and 21st-century competencies, which are more inquiry-based, experiential, and application-oriented. Students will be provided with opportunities and directions through local intra-school competitions, as well as state and national-level events, which will enhance their mutual skills and self-confi-

The school will be equipped with modern infrastructure and facilities, including technology-based smart classrooms, STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) labo ratories, well-developed school and class libraries, a creative thinking area, indoor sports facilities, and resources for music, dance, arts, and

crafts. The school has also arranged for capable and proficient teachers with strong

leadership qualities. Free transportation will be provided for students. Coaching arrangements have been made for students appearing in competitive exams like NEET, JEE, and CLAT, among others. A code of conduct has also been established for students and parents. The school's aim is to provide every student with the opportunity to excel and reach their full potential.

The Approach of CM Rise School1. Holistic Education: CM Rise School will focus on the overall development of every child, meaning the development of intellectual, mental, physical, emotional, and social skills so that they and challenges of life and identify their potential. Holistic development also means providing our students with opportunities to show-case and develop their talents in all fields, from education to the arts, writing, and the stage.

CM Rise Schools will emphasize these skills at the core of our perspective. Educational Excellence:

CM Rise Schools will maintain a certain standard of educational excellence and equip students with strong analytical skills to succeed in various national and international examinations and fields. Student Council: CM Rise

can face the various demands council (school parliament) along with a student leadership system that includes school heads, house captains, and class captains, along with various other committees. These students will work in collaboration with the school leadership team to lead and support the overall development of the school. Student representatives will be elected to take on certain responsibilities within and outside the classroom.

School Resources: The school will provide facilities such as mid-day meals, medical check-ups, fully equipped buildings, smart digital classrooms, all types of laboratories (such as science labs, computer labs, math labs), competent teachers, resources for art, music, sports, etc. Transportation arrangements will be made for students. Preprimary education and vocational education will also be provided. Education will be available in both Hindi and English mediums. Coaching facilities for various competitive exams such as JEE, NEET, CLAT, etc., will be available for students. A code of conduct has been established for students and par-

childhood care and education, in coordination with Department of Women and Child Development, 1500 KG classes have been started with 'one school one campus' schools as a pilot in 5 districts - Bhopal, Chhindwara, Sehore, Sagar and Shahdol to implement the National Education Policy, 2020.

A State Curriculum Framework under NEP has been presented to NCERT and efforts are on for online orientation of officers, principals, teachers on NEP

The Department of School Education has accorded priority to implementing the provisions of the National Education Policy, 2020, and has taken a number of initiatives such as constitution of a State Level Task Force.

Five online courses have been prepared for the

training of teachers, while educational material has on local games, songs, poems, stories and riddles have been prepared in the local and regional language dialect. In addition Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) State Core Committee has been constituted, with exercise books for children, teachers' guide and teacher training initiated.

In addition, steps have been initiated with respect to development of curriculum and pedagogy in schools, including development of primers for teaching at prīmary level in local/tribal dialects like Gondi, Bhili, Korku etc.

There have been efforts for ensuring equitable and inclusive education, namely for Children with Special Needs (CWSN) and for boys and girls especially from socially and economically disadvantaged

groups.

Flagship Schemes Facilitate **Educational Quality**

n addition, the Department **▲**been running a number of flagship schemes with a focus on enhancing infrastructure, providing scholarships and other aid to facilitate quality education for all. **Excellence schools**

For the purpose of providing quality education at secondary and higher secondary level in government schools, a government higher secondary school has been developed as a school of excellence in each district and block headquarters. At present, the schools of excellence are operational in 43 district headquarters and 196 blocks (remaining excellence schools are CM Rise schools) Presently, at district level excellence schools, 45280 students have been benefited while at block level schools, more than one lakh students have been benefited. Scheme for construction and operation of hostels along with district level excellence schools has also been started. At present, 45 hostels have their own building constructed in which hostels are being operated.

In the financial year 2022-23, the amount of Rs 11.49 crores has been provisioned for grant of excellence schools. Rs 7.35 crore was allocated till the third quarter and amount of Rs 6.13 crore has been spent. Under the hostel operation scheme, Rs 11.80 crores has been provisioned out of which Rs 8.1 crore has been allocated against which 7.35 crore has

been spent.

Model schools

Govt. of India launched a centrally sponsored scheme in the year 2011-2012 to establish model schools in Educationally Backward Blocks. These schools were planned to be developed as benchmarks. Since 2015-16, this scheme is operated as State scheme. From year 2016-17, maximum 100 seats have been fixed in each class. Admission in class 9th of the model schools is done through a selection test. Model schools are functioning in all 201 educationally backward



state. These schools have been successful in providing suitable study facilities to the talented students residing in rural areas. Presently, 54,795 students are studying in these model schools. From the year 2020-21, class 6 has been started in these model schools so that students can get education from class 6

to 12 in same campus itself. From year 2022-23, 55 model schools are being developed under the CM Rise scheme. Out of remaining 146 schools, model schools have been constructed at 144 locations. Construction work of remaining two is in progress. This FY in 2022-23, Rs.12.82 crore has been provisioned for the scheme, Rs 8.20 crore was allocated till the third quarter and amount of Rs 8.00 crore has been spent.

Vidyalaya The scheme provides for access and quality education to girls from disadvantaged groups belonging to SC, ST, OBC, minority communities and BPL families aspiring to study in classes VI to XII; and ensure smooth transition of girls from elementary to secondary and upto class XII wherever possible. The scheme runs under Samagra Shiksha which aims at bridging gender and social category gaps at all levels of school education. KGBV provides the facility to have at-least one residential school for girls from classes VI-XII in every educationally back-

development blocks in the and additional 324 girls hostels were established in which 56 thousand girls are being benefited. Sports for Development scheme is being implemented in collaboration with UNICEF for the girls in these hostels and schools

Schools of different levels

were operated as separate units in the same premises under the Department of School Education, due to which the human and physical resources available in different schools located in the same premises were not being utilized to the maximum in the interest of the students. By integration of different schools located in the same campus, availability of class-wise and subject-wise teachers have increased. About 35 thousand schools located in about 16 thousand campuses have been identified and merged as one campus one

school Super 100 scheme

Under this scheme, students of government schools who get 70 percent or more marks in the 10th state board examination are given admission through a selection test Selected students get to study class 11th and 12th in Subhash Excellence Higher Secondary School, Bhopal and Government Malhar Ashram Higher Secondary School, Indore. Alongside, they are provided with necessary coaching for admission in courses like engineering, medical, C.A., etc. through competitive examinations. In the financial year 2022-23, by making a budget provision of Rs 4 crore, the goal

is to benefit 608 students.

SC Students Get Excellent Hostel Facilities

n view of providing suitable accommodation and a conducive environment for education to Scheduled Caste students, separate junior, senior, and collegiate hostels are available for boys and girls. The state enhancing hostel facilities. Students receive free accommodation and meals, and the establishment-related expenses for employees are also borne.

Currently, there are 28,115 seats in 571 junior hostels, 1,153 in senior hostels, 55,522 in collegiate hostels, 10,115 in 189 collegiate hostels, and 6,400 in 20 divisional level residential schools for Scheduled Caste students. There are 1,933 hostels in operation to promote the educational development of Scheduled Caste students, offering free residential facilities from class 6 up to the collegiate level. For the year 2022-23, scholarships in the amount of RS. 1,460 per month for boys and RS. 1,500 per month for girls are being provided from July 1, 2022, based on the Consumer Price Index for April 1, 2022. Adequate meal arrangements are ensured for students. and free bedding and other academic facilities are provided in residential institutions.

In government institutions, including Navodaya Residential Schools, against approved seats of 100,152 for the year 2022-23, more than 70,000 students have enrolled. Financial expenditure for the operation of junior, senior, collegiate hostels, and Navodaya Residential Schools in the financial year amounts to RS. 3,432.5 million. **Excellent Hostel Facilities**

With a view to ensuring the holistic educational development of Scheduled Caste students, there are a total of 58 district-level excellent hostels (one for boys and one for girls) in 29 majority Scheduled Caste districts. Additionally, there are 279 district-level excellent hostels for boys and girls in development blocks of 37 districts. These hostels provide quality amenities such as nutritious meals, breakfast, free accommodation, subject-wise coaching, computer training, libraries, sports equipment, etc. Special coaching is provided in English, Science, and Mathematics to these students for their excellent education. Students residing and studying in excellent hostels are given an amount of Rs. 2,000 per student per year for stationery and other educational materials. There are 17,250 approved seats for the year 2022-23. Rs. 41.7 million has been spent on the operation of excellent hostels in the year

2022-23. Recognition for Excellence in Hostel Management

With the aim of encourage ing the efficient management and organization of residential institutions, significant changes Excellence Awards Scheme since 2018-19. Based on selected criteria, cash awards of up to Rs. 10,000 and commendation certificates are given to officials/employees responsible for the best residential institutions at the district and state levels. The distribution of awards at the district level is scheduled for January 26.

Library Facilities in Hostels

A library plan is being implemented to provide books related to the students' curriculum and life skills for the convenience of students in hostels. This plan benefits 100,152 students studying in 1,933 hostels. Hostel Day Plan

To recognize multifaceted talent, foster mutual respect and harmony, reward talented students, and encourage student participation and suggestions, Hostel Day is celebrated annually on November 1 (Madhya Pradesh Establishment Day) in residential institutions. A communal meal is also organized on this occasion, benefiting students entering hostels.

Cycling To Education

irl Students Get Great Support In Pursuing JSupport III Education Free bicycle distribution scheme has benefited students immensely. This scheme is for both male and female stuhut it has mad girl students to go to middle school or high school located away from their native villages. This has reduced the drop-out rate for girls after 5th or 8th grade. The results are evident in the NFHS-5 figures. Literacy among women aged 15 to 49 has increased to 65.4 percent, and girls attending school for 10 years or more have reached 29.3 per-

Until two decades ago, the dropout rate for girls at the school level was much higher compared to boys. Various studies revealed that parents did not send their daughters to study in other villages or towns because there were no middle schools or high schools in their own village. Walking to and from other villages and safety concerns were major reasons. The Free Bicycle Distribution Scheme was introduced in 2004, and since then, it has become easier for girls to pursue further education in schools located in other villages or towns.

This scheme benefits students studying in middle schools or high schools located in other

villages or towns where there are no such schools in their own village. Students who have to travel more than 2 kilometers on foot to reach school in the same village also benefit from this me Girls resid areas and studying in girls' hostels also benefit, especially if the distance from the hostel to the school is more than 2 kilometers. However, they are not provided with individual bicycles. Instead, they deposit their bicycles at the

hostel when leaving. Every year, around 5 lakh students benefit from this scheme, with adjustments made to the price of the bicycle each year. In the year 2016-17, the picycle's price was set at Rs. 3,192, benefiting 5,91,000 children. In 2017-18, the bicycle's price was set at Rs. 3,295, benefiting 6,60,000 children. In 2018-19, the bicycle's price was set at Rs. 3,357, benefiting 5,96,000 children. In 2019-20, the bicycle's price was set at Rs. 3,376, benefiting 5,92,000 children. In the year 2022-23, the bicycle's price was set at Rs. 3,900, benefiting 5,50,000 children. This year, 2023-24, the bicycle's price has been set at Rs. 4,500, and it is estimated that more than 4,50,000 children will be able to easily travel to school by purchasing their preferred bicycle

Happier to become micro Entrepreneurs

The rural economy of Madhya Pradesh is undergoing a revolutionary change. The economic landscape of the rural area is positively altered through diverse economic activities taken up by women's self-help groups. Women in Madhya Pradesh have received finan-

cial and technical support from the MP Rural Livelihoods Mission, which was launched in 2012. The Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has taken two transformative decisions First, each member of women's self-help groups will have a monthly income of at least Rs. 10,000 and second such groups will receive bank loans at only two percent

At present, 4,78,000 selfhelp groups have engaged 57 lakh families. They are living in villages and all of them are below poverty line. Members of these groups are being provided with self-employ-ment and skill-based livelihood opportunities in the areas of their interests. This will help economically weaker families earn substantially from economic ventures.

150 economic activities Through these groups, approximately Rs. 1,417 crore have been provided as revolving funds and community investment funds. This amount is a grant and is controlled by the groups and their federations. About Rs. 6,830 crore have been provided as loans from banks. Group members are engaged



non-agricultural livelihood activities, numbering around 150 activities.

Nearly, 21 lakh families have been linked to livelihood activities based on agriculture and animal husbandry, while around 6 lakh 53 thousand families have been associated with non-agricultural livelihood activities. About 63 thousand women are involved in sewing and garment making, while 12,500 women are engaged in sanitary napkin production/packaging, 15,890 in incense stick making, 14,950 in preparing cleanliness products and 1,286 in

138 Didi cafes, 1,324 livelihood fresh outlets, 5 lakh 32 thousand families are engaged in commercial vegetable production and around 2 lakh 76 thousand families are engaged in dairy production.

In the last two years, 109 lakh soaps, 4,315 tons of washing powder, nearly 2.2 million liters of phenyl, 67,670 tons of incense sticks, 4,000 tons of spices (turmeric and coriander), 28 lakh slippers, 21 lakh kg pickles, 337,000 kilograms of honey, 30 lakh liters of edible mustard oil, 1.242 million kilograms of mushroom production, and 11 lakh sanitary pads have been produced. help group, our family's fortunes have changed. We took a loan of Rs. 70,000 from the group and started a flour mill. This resulted in a good income for us. We repaid the group's loan as well.

After that, we also received assistance from the group and were provided with tube wells for our fields, leading to improved farming. We planted a guava orchard in 2.5 acres. Now, we earn an annual income of 3 to 4 lakhs

expressed her happiness and said that Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has made a significant contribution to empowering us. She emotionally shared that she and other women from Sahariya tribal families had the opportunity to speak before Prime Minister Ji. We are truly blessed.

lakh per year.

My husband was employed elsewhere and was earning only Rs. 150 a day as a laborer. After joining the self-help group, we took a loan of 20,000 rupees and started a shaved ice business and bought a sewing machine.

This led to a monthly income of Rs. 30,000 for our family. After that, we received training in fish farming and started largescale fish farming. This is giving us a substantial income. This year, I received an Amrit Sarovar for fish farming. Joining the group has opened up new oppor-

Millet Queen Honoured

M.P. To Become 'Millet State': CM

Proud of Lahari Bai, who has shown exemplary enthusiasm for Shri Anna. Her efforts will inspire many others. When Prime Minister Narendra Modi tweeted this none knew who Lahari Bai was. Today, Lahari Bai is known as "The Millet Queen." UNESCO declared 2023 as International Year of Millets, This assumes greater significance for Lahari means being great. Lahari Bai, a 28-year-old

tribal woman living in the Silpudi village of the Bajag Development Block, located about 60 kilometers from Dindori, a predominantly tribal district in Madhya Pradesh. She has been managing a Millets Seed Bank for nearly a decade. In a small, makeshift room in her modest earthen home, she has built a seed bank for endangered seeds, including many grains that are not known to others.

Very recently, President Draupadi Murmu awarded Lahari Bai the with 'Plant Genome Guardian Farmer Award' for the year 2021-22 for her dedication to the conservation and development of Shri Anna species(millets). Lahari Bai was also honored with a cash prize of Rs. 1,50,000, a commendation letter, and a memento at the Global Farmers' Rights Conference, New Delhi.

More than 150 varieties of seeds are available in her seed bank, which she has carefully preserved over the years. Lahari Bai has even built a large shed to safeguard the seeds. The seed bank includes four varieties of Kang: Bhursa Kang, Safed Kalki Kang, Lal Kalki Kang, and Kariya Kalki Kang. It also con-



Baga Salahar, Kata Salahar, and Ainthe Salahar, four varieties of Kodo: Bade Kodo, Ladri Kodo, Baheeri Kodo, and Chhoti Kodo, and eight varieties of Kutki: Bade Dongar Kutki, Safed Dongar Kutki, Lal Dongar Kutki, Char Kutki, Birni Kutki, Sitahi Kutki, Nan Bai Kutki, Nagdavan Kutki, Chhotahi Kutki, and Bhadeli Kutki. Additionally, Lahari Bai has seeds for pulses such as Bidri Rawas, Jhunjhuru, Sutaru, Hirwa, and Bagha Rahad. Lahari Bai distributes these

seeds to neighbouring villages and collects them after crops are harvested. This way, rare seeds that were on the verge of extinction are given a new life with each crop cycle, thanks to Lahari Bai's efforts.

So far, she has inspired more than 300 farmers to contribute seeds to her seed bank and motivate others to save seeds. Lahari Bai has been cultivating these traditional seeds in the villages of Samnapur, Bajag, and Karanjia

within three development blocks. Many farmers in villages like Kivad, Chapwara, Gaura, Dhoba, Jeelang, Ajgar, Lamothe, Pandapur, Limaha, Domohani, Kendra, Ladara, Piparpani, Barthana, and Kandatola are also supplementing her efforts. Lahari Bai travels from village to village, distributing seeds and collecting them back in equal volume after harvesting

It's worth mentioning that three years before the announcement of the International Year of Millets 2023, Shivraj Singh Chouhan had already launched the State Millet Mission in Madhya Pradesh, which has immense potential for milletbased food products and processing. The state is second in millet production in the country. Dindori district is a milletrich district, and Lahari Bai is the brand ambassador of Dindori district and of course all of those concerned about disappearing seeds.

not subcontract the work to any other agency. If the toll collection exceeds Rs.2 crore, MPRDC will resume the task. Life insurance of SHG members will also be ensured. Toll collection revenue will be deposited into the joint bank account

every day. Prior to toll collection, expenses will be incurred on other administrative arrangements at toll plazas, such as internet, electricity, and water.

Initially, cleaning, record-keeping related works will be performed by the SHGs.The Madhya Pradesh model of women's empowerment draws strength from self-help groups. More than 4 lakh 78 thousand self-help groups cover 57 lakh families. So far, 5.26 lakh selfhelp groups have been linked to credit of more than Rs. 6358 crore.

Through the Livelihood Mart portal, self-help groups have sold products worth more than Rs. 700 crore. Women in the SHGs are engaged in various activities such as operating Ready to Eat plants, purchasing crops at fair prices, uniform manufacturing, water cess collection, fly ash brick production, biscuit making, electricity bill collection, Didi Cafe, mask-sanitizer production, and more.

The annual turnover of seven Ready To Eat plants by these groups has exceeded Rs. 750 crore. Group members are operating Aajeevika Express

passenger vehicles. Approximately 8,300 women have been trained for low-cost agriculture and organic farming methods. They have established their identity by providing services in their villages, districts, states, as well as other states like Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Punjab, among others.

PARLIAMENT TURNS UNPARLIAMENTARY

BJP lambasts its MP Bidhuri for jibe, issues show cause notice

Aday after Parliament was adjourned sine die, a massive political controversy erupted on Friday over the use of offensive language by South Delhi BJP MP Ramesh Bidhuri against Bahujan Samaj Party MP Danish Ali in the Lok Sabha during a discussion on the success of the Chandrayaan mission on Thursday. While leaders of the Opposition par-ties, including Ali, demanded swift action against Bidhuri, the BJP issued a show-cause notice to its two-time MP on Friday.

Th BJP sources said the party has sought a reply from the South Delhi MP as to why disciplinary action should not be taken against him for his use of unparliamentary words. Generally, those served the notice are given 15 days to answer.

"We are truly dismayed by our MP's behaviour, especially considering that this incident occurred on a day when the nation was celebrating the passage of the Women's Bill and the success of Chandrayaan, both of which were being widely reported across the country. Furthermore, it coincided with an unprecedented record of productivity in both the Houses during the four-day Special Session in new Parliament," a top BJP leader told The Pioneer,

requesting anonymity.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, who had earlier initiated a discussion on the country's Chandrayan success, said though he could not hear the comments of his party col-league in the House, he person-

ally apologised for the remarks.

Lok Sabha Speaker Om
Birla has taken "serious note" of the unparliamentary remarks made by Bidhuri and warned him of "strict action" if such a behaviour is repeated in the future, officials said. While the objectionable

remarks have been expunged from the proceeding records, a video of Bidhuri, in which he can be heard making deroga-tory remarks against Ali, is now circulating on various social media platforms.

Ali has also written to the Speaker demanding that the matter be sent to the Committee of Privileges.

"Saying this with a heavy heart that I would be considering quitting the Lok Sabha if an appropriate action is not taken against Bidhuri over his remarks," Ali said, adding he was also threatened by Bidhuri in the speech.

"I sent my letter to the office of the Lok Sabha Speaker and I am confident that he will take cognizance of the incident and appropriate action. I have given notice. All things are on record and it is happening for

Several Opposition members owing allegiance to the INDIA bloc visited the BSP MP. After meeting Ali at his Pandara Road residence, Congress MP Rahul Gandhi told the media, "Nafrat ke Bazaar mein Mohabbat ki

Dukan (opening a shop of love in the market of hate)." Opposition parties are demanding strict action against Bidhuri, including suspension from the House and even his

Opposition leaders criticised BJP MPs Ravi Shankar Prasad and Harsh Vardhan for allegedly laughing while Bidhuri fied a broadside at Ali in the Lok Sabha. However, both Prasad and Vardhan have distanced themselves from the the controversy.

Harsh Vardhan, who represents Chandni Chowk Lok Sabha seat, issued a statement regretting the foul language used by his party colleague in the temple of democracy. "I have been brought up in Chandni Chowk and my childhood spent with Muslims in the bylanes of this old Delhi and am thankful that people have sent me to the Lok Sabha from this locality only," Harsh Vardhan said.

The Opposition leaders highlighted instances where members from their own alliance, such as TMC, Shiv Sena, and AAP parliamentarians, were promptly reprimanded by the presiding officers of either House, and in some cases, they even faced suspensions.

Some of them were suspended for merely protesting in front of the Gandhi statue in Parliament, including women MPs, during the entire last Winter Session.

"Sanjay Singh and Raghav Chadha (of the AAP) stand suspended even today for exercising their democratic right of protest inside Parliament and Bidhuri has spoken in a language that is an insult not only to Ali but also to every MP and every Indian," Opposition

Describing the remarks as an insult to all MPs, Congress chief spokesman Jairam Ramesh said the apology offered by Singh was a "mere eyewash" and not acceptable.

"It is an absolute shame what Bidhuri has said. Singh's apology is simply not acceptable. It is a half-hearted apology, it was an afterthought. What Bidhuri has said is an insult to Parliament and makes a mockery of what the prime minister keeps repeating 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikaas, Sabka Sabka Vishvaas, Sabka Prayas' which becomes all 'bakwaas' (nonsense)," Ramesh told reporters.

CPI(M) members have demanded the arrest of Bidhuri, who is known for his abusive nature even on public platforms. "No privilege for hate speech, arrest Bidhuri. Filthy abusive language used by Bidhuri against Ali on the Floor constitutes the worst kind of hate speech indicted by the SC. No MP can claim privilege for such speech. He should be arrested," the CPI(M)

said in a statement.
"Abusing Muslims, OBCs an integral part of BJP culture most now see nothing wrong with it. Narendra Modi has reduced Indian Muslims to living in such a state of fear in their own land that they grin & bear everything. Sorry but I'm

calling this out. Ma Kali holds my spine," Trinamool Congress member Mahua Moitra said in a statement.

She demanded that Modi and the Speaker take strict action against Bidhuri.

"Filthy language used by a BJP parliamentarian for fellow MP Ali. No shame left. This is sickening. Will Speaker Lok Sabha take note and take action," Shiv Sena (UBT) leader and Rajya Sabha member Priyanka Chaturvedi told The Pioneer when sought for her comments on the row. Aam Aadmi Party leader

Sanjay Singh wondered whether Bidhuri's language was a result of the values taught by the RSS. "I raised the issue of violence in Manipur and I was suspended. What action will be taken against this MP who abused Ali," Singh said on social media platforms.

The AAP also slammed

BJP Lok Sabha members Harsh Vardhan and Ravi Shankar Prasad for "laughing" when Bidhuri was abusing Ali.

"Why is this uncouth, uncultured BJP MP Bidhuri not suspended for his use of unparliamentary language and obnoxious behaviour in the Lok Sabha? Speaker Birla must take immediate action. Will BJP also suspend him from their party or will they give him a promotion," NCP spokesman Clyde Crasto said.

Each State gets high speed train

In a remarkable feat of histor-lical achievement, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to inaugurate nine Vande Bharat Express trains on Sunday. With this, all States across the country will now be connected with ese semi-high-speed trains

In June, Modi inaugurated eight Vande Bharat trains on different routes.

Among these nine trains, the Ministry of Railways led by Ashwani Vaishnaw is poised to introduce two trains for West Bengal's Howrah and Tamil Nadu's Chennai, with one each for Kerala, Odisha, Telangana, Gujarat, and the poll-bound Rajasthan.

The nine trains which will be flagged off on Sunday are on routes — Ranchi-Howrah, Patna-Howrah, Vijayawada-Chennai, Tirunelveli-Chennai, Rourkela-Puri, Udaipur-Jaipur, Kasaragod-Thiruvanantha puram, Jamnagar-Ahmedabad and Hyderabad-Bengaluru.

The inaugural Tirunelveli-Chennai Vande Bharat Express train will leave from Tirunelveli Junction 6 am and reach Chennai around 1:50 pm, while

the return journey will begin at Coimbatore Vande Bharat train. 2:50 pm on all days except Tuesdays.

According to reports, the locomotive will be operated at an average speed of 83.30 km an hour and halt at Virudhunagar, Madurai, Dindigul and Tiruchi.

Meanwhile, this will also be Tamil Nadu's third Vande Bharat route after the launch of Chennai-Mysuru Vande Bharat Express in November last vear and subsequently the Chennai-

Odisha's second Vande Bharat express on Puri-Rourkela route is also set to be flagged off on Sunday. The full trial run of the Puri-Rourkela Vande Bharat Express was conducted on

Wednesday. The train will connect the coastal districts of the State to its western region. Earlier, it was also reported that the semi-high speed train will cover the distance of 505 km

in 7 hours and 30 minutes from

Puri-Rourkela and 7 hours and 45 minutes on the down line i.e. Rourkela to Puri. Bengaluru and Hyderabad

Vande Bharat train will link the two tech cities and will cover the 610 km distance in 8.5 hours.

Speaking about its tentative schedule, the train will depart from Kacheguda in Hyderabad 5.30 am and will reach Yeshwantpur around 2 pm.

In the return journey, the train will depart at 2:45pm and reach Kacheguda at 11:15 pm.

The semi-high speed train is likely to have 5 stops — Mahabubnagar, Kurnool City, Anantapur, Dhone, Dharmavaram. Vande Bharat express between Vijavawada-Chennai will cover the distance between the two cities in 6 hours and 40

minutes. Earlier this month, Vaishnaw had announced that Madhya Pradesh's Neemuch would soon get a Vande Bharat

The State Government has decided to expand its ambitious Odisha Management Information System (OeHMIS) to another 223 healthcare institutions of the State in two phases.

According to official sources, 112 health institutes will be covered in the first phase and later another 111 health institutes shall be covered. In the first phase almost all healthcare facilities in Khurda and Jharsuguda districts will be covered under the project. As many as 21 Community Health Centres (CHCs), 28 Urban Primary Health Centres (UPHCs) and 63 Primary Healthcare Centres of the two districts will be connected under OeHMIS.

Similarly, 32 Sub-Divisional Hospitals (SDHs), 78 CHCs covered under Ama Hospital and one PHC covered under the Ama Hospital scheme will get the new internet based-system in the second phase, the sources In total, 24 Urban Primary

Health Centres, 47 PHCs, and 15 CHCs of Khurda district and 6 CHCs, four UPHCs, and 16 PHCs of Jharsuguda district will be covered in the first phase.

To implement the project, the Health Department has asked the Odisha Computer Application Centre (OCAC) to provide Fibre To The Home (FTTH) Connectivity at the health institutes. Accordingly, the OCAC has floated a tender for this purpose.





1st 'One Nation One Election' meet under Kovind today

 $T^{he \ first \ meeting \ of \ the}_{\ high-level \ committee \ under}$ former president Ram Nath Kovind for simultaneous elections as known as One Nation One Election will be held on Saturday to discuss the roadmap and how to go about holding consultation with stakeholders.

Kovind had recently media told that the meeting will be held on September 23.

The Government had on September 2 notified the eightmember "high-level" panel to examine and make recommendations at the earliest on the issue of holding simultaneous elections to the Lok Sabha, state assemblies, municipalities and panchayats.

People aware of the details said the meeting will be "introductory" in nature and members will discuss the roadmap on how to go about the mandate given to the panel.

The panel, they said, will also discuss on how to go about holding consultations with stakeholders, research on the subject and preparation of

Home Minister Amit Shah, former leader of the opposition in Rajya Sabha Ghulam Nabi Azad and former finance commission chairman N K Singh are among the committee's members.

Congress' leader in the Lok Sabha Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury was also a member. However, in a letter to Home Minister Shah, he declined to be part of the "I have no hesitation what-

soever in declining to serve on the committee whose terms of reference have been prepared in a manner to guarantee its conclusions. It is, I am afraid, a total eyewash," Chowdhury had said in the letter. The government notifica-

tion said the panel will commence functioning immediately and make recommendations "at the earliest", but did not specify a time-frame to submit the report. The decision to have a

committee under former president Kovind had caught opposition bloc INDIA, holding their conclave in Mumbai on September 1, by surprise and



further raised the political heat. The opposition alliance had slammed the decision as a 'threat" to the country's feder-

The high-level committee will also have former Lok Sabha secretary general Subhash C Kashyap, senior advocate Harish Salve and former chief vigilance Commissioner Sanjay Kothari as members.

Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal will attend the meetings of the committee as a special invitee, while Law Secretary Niten Chandra will be the secretary to the panel.

The committee will examine and recommend specific amendments to the Constitution, the Representation of the People Act and any other laws and rules which would require

amendments for the purpose of holding simultaneous elections.

It has also been tasked to suggest a framework for synchronisation of elections and "specifically suggest the phases and time-frame within which simultaneous elections may be held if they cannot be held in one go...".

It will also examine and recommend if the amendments to the Constitution would require ratification by states. Certain amendments to

the Constitution require ratification by at least 50 per cent of the state assemblies.

The committee will also analyse and recommend possible solutions to scenarios such as hung House, adoption of no-confidence motion, or defection or any such other event in case of simultaneous

The committee has also been asked to recommend "necessary safeguards for ensuring the continuity of the cycle of simultaneous elections and recommend necessary amendments Constitution so that the cycle of simultaneous elections is not disturbed".

The issue of logistics is also on the agenda of the panel as the massive exercise would require additional number of EVMs and paper-trail machines, polling and security personnel.

It will also examine and recommend the modalities of use of a single electoral roll and electoral identity cards for identification of voters in elections to the Lok Sabha, state legislative assemblies, municipalities and panchayats.

A parliamentary committee had recently said that a common electoral roll will help reduce expenses and prevent manpower being deployed for a work on which another agency is already working.

While the Election Commission (ED) is mandated to hold parliamentary and

assembly polls, state election commission's (SECs) hold local body elections. The EC and the SECs are separate bodies under the Constitution with a fixed mandate.

The original proposal was for simultaneous elections to all three tiers of democracy -- Lok Sabha (543 MPs), Vidhan Sabha (4,120 MLAs) and the panchayats/ municipalities (30 lakh members). The notification had point-

ed out that elections to the Lok Sabha and legislative assemblies were mostly held simultaneously from 1951-52 to 1967 after which this cycle got broken and now, elections are held almost every year and within a year too at different times, which result in massive expenditure by the government and other stakeholders.

It also leads to diversion of security forces and other electoral officers engaged in such elections from their primary duties for significantly prolonged periods.

Concerns over complacency in implementing TB elimination programme

Parliamentary panel has Aexpressed its concerns over "a sense of complacency" with-in the Union Health Ministry and the Government organisations responsible for implementing the TB elimination programme and instead suggested a string of measures such as a network of dedicated TB clinics and centres equipped with necessary diagnostic and treatment facilities with adequate manpower among others to ensure the target to eliminate the deadly infectious disease by 2025.

It is five years ahead of the global target 2030.

As India continues to be the most significant contributor to global TB incidence and approximately one-fourth of total cases i.E. Roughly 25 lakh out of 1.05 crore are reported in India, the panel suggested that it was doubtful to reach the elimination target.

The report pointed out that the shifting of responsibility to non-governmental organisations "eventually may impede the overall progress" of TB eradication. The committee suggested

that the government establish a robust selection process for Ni-kshay Mitra and implement effective monitoring mechanisms to ensure their diligent fulfilment of responsibilities

Under the Pradhan Mantri TB Mukt Bharat Abhiyan (Nikshay Mitra initiative) implemented by the Ministry, community support is provided to TB patients through the Nikshay 2.0 portal on which TB patients can be adopted and cared for by an individual, elected representatives or insti-

The parliamentary committee suggested the need for organising orientation pro-



grammes for Ni-kshay Mitras to acquaint them about TB and its management.

'The close connection between nutrition and TB further reinforced the significance of this programme, as it not only strengthens the immune system of TB patients to fight against disease, it also facilitates community engagement making the TB elimination program a vital part of 24 community-driven efforts," the committee stated.

In order to ensure the proper utilisation of assistance extended by Ni-kshay Mitras, the committee recommended that the government introduce a monitoring mechanism to track the attitude and behaviour of the patients towards the Ni-kshay Mitras, and to provide them appropriate counselling, if required.

The committee feels that the global resources and guidelines would lead to more effective implementation of PMTBMBA and achieving universal health coverage. Moreover, community involvement in TB control efforts, fostering awareness, understanding of TB prevention, careseeking behaviour, and adherence to treatment are imperative steps to manage TB dis-

ease," the panel said. The committee suggested that under PMTBMBA programme, political commitment at all levels of governance through regular meetings, discussions, and engagements with key stakeholders should be strengthened.

Course correction


The IMF's call to tax the rich and shield the poor in Pak will not be easy to implement

akistan's dwindling economy has steadily dug its way into such a morass that even sane, helpful and logical directions from the experts outside, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) in this case, do not seem to be able to pull it through. The recent call by IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva to Pakistan for increasing taxation on the wealthy and protecting the poor is a stark reminder of the country's economic woes. The cash-strapped nation, which secured a bailout from the IMF in July, is grappling with double-digit inflation and a range of structural issues that need immediate redressal. Kristalina's meeting with Interim Prime Minister Anwaarul Haq Kakar on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly session has brought the pressing economic issues facing Pakistan to the forefront. Kristalina emphasised the need for Pakistan to collect more taxes from the wealthy and simultaneously protect the country's vulnerable populations. The IMF has long been advocating economic reforms in Pakistan.

Pakistan's economy is reeling under soaring inflation, which has been exacerbated by the conditions attached to the IMF's \$3 billion bailout package. Meanwhile things have only gone from bad to worse for general population. Massive hikes in electricity and petrol prices have driven inflation to a staggering 27.4 per cent last month, placing the citizens under a crushing burden.

The promise of economic stability and growth through the IMF bailout has not yet materialised for the majority of Pakistanis. The IMF's insistence on revenue collection and protecting the most vulnerable segments of society underscores the importance of a bal-

anced approach. But the irony is that this bailout, and even the previous ones, have hardly changed anything. The ordinary Pakistani continues to suffer while the Pakistani elite (especially the army) enjoys the privileges. These measures are essential not only for fiscal sustainability but also for maintaining social cohesion in a country facing considerable economic hardships. The IMF's approval of the \$3 billion standby agreement, which is crucial to prevent a sovereign debt default, has saved the day but the crisis runs deeper in Pakistan's system. It must galvanise and upgrade industry and trade to compete in the international market. But it is resorting to piecemeal reforms such as earmarking 10 Government-owned companies for privatisation. Though this move is in line with the IMF's recommendations as State-owned entities' losses have been straining Government finances, it is not a permanent solution. Pakistan's economy needs structural changes that can create a conducive business environment. The IMF's prescription may not be easy to follow as Pakistan's elite is going to resist it tooth and nail, especially with the general elections slated for January end. In the short term, however, such moves can play a pivotal role in steering Pakistan away from the brink. The path ahead is challenging as it is directly linked with the survival of Pakistan as a State.

Who killed Hardeep Singh Nijjar?





The Indo-Canada relations have deteriorated after the killing of Nijjar, a pro-Khalistani. Are sectional conflicts among Khalistanis in Canada the cause?

rime Minister Justin Trudeau's allegation that Indian agents had murdered the Khalistani leader, Hardeep Singh Nijjar, on June 18, 2023, in Canada, is reportedly based on inputs from intelligence sources. This raises the question as to how reliable these inputs are. No final judgement is possible until these inputs and the evidence behind them are made public. Nevertheless, one can have some idea of the efficiency of the Canadian intelligence and security establishment by looking at their performance in respect of the biggest ever terrorist outrage emanating from Canadian soil-the mid-air explosion that brought down Air India's Boeing 747 aircraft, Emperor Kanishka, carrying flight AI 182 from Toronto to Mumbai via Montreal, off the coast of Ireland. All 329 persons, passengers and staff, on board the flight which had taken off on June 23, 1985, were killed. Only 131 of the bodies could be recovered.

The Air India explosion was a result of negligence, intelligence failure, inaction and lax security arrangement on the part of the Canadian authorities. For quite some time before the explosion there was a fear that Khalistani terrorists in Canada were planning a strike. Alerted, India's Intelligence Bureau had sent a telex message on June 1, 1985, both to Air India's management and the Canadian authorities asking them to beef up security measures to forestall a possible attack on an aircraft by Sikh terrorists.

James Bartleman, then head of Canada's intelligence bureau, got a frosty response from an official of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), whose attention he drew to a highly classified Communications Security Establishment (CSE) document saying that Sikh extremists might be targeting AI 182. He was told that officials were probing the matter. Security measures remained lax. Sniffer dogs remained missing from all Canadian airports lapses "inexcusable" and because they were under training at Vancouver. X-ray screens arrangements at the time at Toronto's Pearson Airport "wholly deficient".



tives who were tracking Talwinder Singh Parmar, founder and leader of terrorist group Babbar Khalsa International (BKI), and subsequently considered to be the mastermind behind the downing of AI-182-- heard an explosives test that he conducted in a forest. They ignored it, thinking that it was a "gunshot!" In its report submitted in

2010, a commission of inquiry, appointed by Stephen Harper, then Canada's Prime Minister, in 2006, and headed by a retired judge of the country's Supreme Court, John Major, condemned several security failures and blunders on part of Canadians that led to the bombing. According to the report, the RCMP and Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) had significant pieces of information that, taken together, "would have led a competent analyst to conclude that Flight 182 was at high risk of being bombed by known Sikh terrorists in June 1985." Lack of coordination among them prevented the risk from being neutralised. The report called the security termed Canadian security

Nor have the post-explosion developments shown any profound regret on the part of the Canadian authorities over what had happened. Nor have they reached out to the victims and their families the way they should have. The earnestness with which investigations into the outrage were conducted is reflected in the fact that only one person Inderjit Singh Reyat, was convicted and, that too, decades after the bombing. Talwinder Singh Parmer, who had returned to India, was killed in an encounter with the Punjab police in 1992. The other accused, including Ripudaman Singh Malik, who was subsequently murdered in Canada on July 14, 2023, were acquitted.

In a searing observation, judge John Major, had stated that Canada had relegated the biggest terrorist attack targeting their country to background. He noted, "I stress this is a Canadian atrocity. For too long the greatest loss of Canadian lives at the hands of terrorists has somehow been relegated outside the Canadian consciousness." Given this background, one can hardly be blamed for doubting, prima facie, Canadian intelligence agen-cies' conclusion that Indian prima facie, agents had murdered Hardeep Singh Nijjar. This is particu-

larly so in the context of Ripudaman Singh Malik's subsequent murder. He had written a letter on January 17, 2022, to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, praising him for his initiative to redress some of the pending demands of the Sikhs. While thanking Modi for removing the names of some Sikhs from the blacklist which prevented them from visiting India, he accused certain "anti-India members" of the Sikh community of running an "orchestrated campaign" against Modi. Back in Surrey in British Columbia, his praise for Modi had prompted a section of Sikhs to accuse him of treachery towards the Sikh qaum. Was he murdered for the 180degree turn in his attitude to

India and Modi? The world of Khalistani terrorists, it appears, is not one of great mutual camaraderie and friendship, but one of sectional acrimony. Was Hardeep Singh Nijjar a victim of this internecine conflict, and the RCMP, CSIS and the CSE have been clueless about this entire matter as they were about the preparations to blow up the Air India flights? The question needs to be looked at

Cooperatives can end Punjab's agriculture woes

Cooperative societies can make agricultrue viable by providing cheap loans, selling agricultural inputs at reasonable rates and buying farm produce at fair price

Dunjab has been the leader in food grain proleader in 1000 grain production; despite the bad weather, this year too, the contribution of wheat to the national grain reserve from Punjab is more than 46 per cent. However, the economic condition of the farmers of Punjab is getting worse. They cannot repay the loans taken on crops and commit suicide. One-third of the farmers in Punjab are either marginal with up to 2.5 acres of land or small farmers with 2.5 to 5 acres of land. Their total land is only 9.7% of the cultivable land in the state. According to a survey, the number of marginal and small farmers with up to 5 acres of land is 3,61,938, while the number of semi-medium farmers with 5 to 10 acres of land is 3,67,938

and medium farmers with 10 to 25 acres of land is 3, 05,220. There are only 57,707 farmer families with more than 25 acres of land. Despite their hard work and optimization of the yield, more than 80 per cent of the farmers in the state

The majority of the farmers depend on six-month yield crops i.e. wheat and paddy, and earn what barely meets the repayment of the money borrowed during the previous six months for expenditure on growing the crop and supporting the families. Then the cash is needed for the next cycle. But they don't have savings to defray the expenses on agricultural implements, seeds, fertilizers and pesticides, on the one hand, and on personal needs, such as food,

clothing and health facilities for the family, children's education and other social responsibilities, on the other. Thus, the farmers have to take a loan for the next term. Small landowners face difficulty in loan sanctions from banks or moneylenders. Due to a lot of paperwork and lateral guarantees, the sanction of bank loans is delayed and sometimes completely refused or else the partial amount is sanctioned. Then the farmer has to approach some private moneylender for a loan at a high interest rate to save the crop. Due to the high interest rate, the real income from the crop decreases, while due to delayed loans, the use of fertiliser and pesticides is delayed causing low yield and losses. Some moneylenders sell fertilgiving the loan amount in cash, so the farmers have to buy these products at the moneylender's price. What is worse is that sometimes the farmers double their losses when they happen to buy fake products.

In such circumstances, cooperative societies can be a solution to this thorny issue. They can purchase agricultural inputs like quality seeds, fertilizers and pesticides in bulk at competitive prices and sell to the farmers at a marginal profit, sanctioning the total cost as a crop loan at low interest. Societies can buy farm machinery and tools and rent to such farmers at a reasonable cost. This will benefit both farmers and cooperatives.

Tndian-American Republican Ipresidential aspirant Vivek Ramaswamy has called for declaring "economic independence" from China, for which he proposed a slew of measures including an expanded rela-tionship with countries like

In a major foreign policy speech in his home state Ohio on Thursday, Ramaswamy also underlined the need to move away from Chinese-controlled pharmaceutical supply chains and increase military spending.

"What we are laying out here is a clear and pragmatic vision for how we will actually, finally at long last declare economic independence from China while actually advancing American prosperity at home, the 38-year-old biotech entrepreneur said.

"I will not sell you a fake vision of onshoring everything immediately. That's not going to happen if we are serious about decoupling from China. It will also require expanded relationships with India, Israel and Brazil," said Ramaswamy, whose popularity has been on the rise since his impressive performance at the first Republican presidential primary debate last month.

Ramaswamy said if he is elected president of the country in November 2024, his policy of declaring independence from China will have four elements. This includes declaring "independence from the climate change agenda" that Ramaswamy described as a "farce" and "hoax".

He said that he would also achieve economic independence from Taiwan by increasing production of US semiconductors, the "little chips" that

tems, medical devices and other communication devices.

He called for increasing military spending to "defend our own homeland," and move away from Chinese-controlled pharmaceutical supply chains out of concern that China "could lace our legal pharma-coutical supply chain with poi ceutical supply chain with poison, including fentanyl".

US and China launch economic groups with aim of easing tensions

The US Treasury Department and China's Ministry of Finance launched a pair of economic working groups on Friday in an effort to ease tensions and deepen ties between the nations.

Led by Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen and Vice Premier He Lifeng, the working groups will be divided into economic and financial seg-

The working groups will establish a durable channel of communication between the world's two largest economies," Yellen said in a series of planned tweets shared with The Associated Press ahead of Friday's announcement.

Yellen said the groups will "serve as important forums to communicate America's interests and concerns, promote a healthy economic competition between our two countries with a level playing field for American workers and busi-

The announcement follows a string of high-ranking administration officials' visits to China this year, which sets the stage for a possible meeting between President Joe Biden and his Chinese counterpart, Xi Jinping, in November at an Asia-Pacific Economic conference in San Francisco.

The two finance ministers have agreed to meet at a "regular cadence," the Treasury Department said in a news release.

Yellen, along with other Biden administration officials, travelled to China this year after the Democratic president directed key senior officials to "maintain communication and deepen constructive efforts after he me with Xi in Bali last year.

The groups' launch also comes after Secretary of State Antony Blinken met with China's vice president on Monday on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly.

At least 80 high-profile corruption cases, including those against former prime ministers Nawaz Sharif and Shehbaz Sharif and ex-president Asif Ali Zardari, sharif and ex-president Ash All Zardan, would be revived following a recent landmark ruling by the Supreme Court, according to a media report on Friday.

These are among the hundreds of cases closed as a result of amendments

made to the anti-corruption laws by the previous government led by the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) led by Nawaz Sharif. The hearing for these cases would begin soon, officials sources said.

An apex court bench, headed by former Chief Justice of Pakistan Umar Ata Bandial, had on September 15 declared the amendments to the anti-graft laws void and directed the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) to revive within seven days the closed cases against public office

The apex court had announced its reserved decision on jailed former prime minister Imran Khan's plea filed last year, challenging the amendments made to the accountability laws by the then government led by Śhehbaz Śharif.

NAB prosecution has submitted the record of 80 cases to the accountability court in Islamabad, the Dawn newspaper reported. Several others have been returned to the accountability courts of

Rawalpindi and Quetta.

According to official sources, about 2,000 cases, which were earlier closed, are being reopened against officials and businessmen after the intervention by the apex

The 80 cases transmitted to the local accountability court included the Park Lane case against Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) leader Zardari, Universal Services Funds, in which former prime minister Syed Yousaf Raza Gilani and others are suspects; the Rental Power Projects case against former premier Raja Pervaiz Ashraf, and the case of Benazir Income Support Programme's former chairperson Farzana Raja.

The cases against former prime minister Shaukat Aziz and fake accounts cases against Zardari and Omni Group's directors also stand revived.

Pakistan political parties demand exact date for Jan 2024 elections

Pakistan's political parties have demanded an exact polling date from the election commission, a day after it announced that the general election will be held in the "final week of January 2024". The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) on Thursday issued a vague timeline for elections without disclosing a specific date for the polls, sparking mixed reactions from politicians.

HUM News TV, in a story, highlighted the reaction of various parties to the ECP announcement. The main opposition party, the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP), rued that the ECP failed to announce a definitive date and demand-

"The election commission has not provided a definitive date yet," PPP leader Shazia Marri said. Senior Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leader Ahsan Iqbal said that his party welcomed the decision by the ECP as it has ended the uncertainty about the delimitation.

"Everyone knew from the first day that the election commission was bound to conduct delimitation after the census,"

Iqbal said that uncertainty should end after the announcement of polls and all political parties should start preparations now."It is important that the elections are held peacefully and a stable government

is formed that takes the country out of the economic crisis," the former planning minister was quoted as saying by Geo News. He added that any party that comes into power should take all the parties on the same page and work on the economic agenda with consensus.

Commenting on the "uncertainty surrounding the election date," PPP leader Qamar Zaman Kaira stressed that a level playing field and a clear and transparent election process were essential. The ECP had on Thursday said in an official statement that it had assessed the progress of constituency delimitation and decided to release the initial list for constituency delimitation on September 27.

Following a period of consideration of objections and suggestions regarding this process, the final list will be unveiled on November 30. It had said that by the end of delimitation, it would announce a 54-day election programme after November 30 and "polls will be held in the last week of January 2024."

The HUM News TV report quoted the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), another opposition party, which has also sought clarity on the final election date. It quoted PML-N leader Ahsan Iqbal as saying, "Once the process of constituency delimitation is completed, the ECP should announce the final election date. We need to put an end to this uncertainty."

'War in Sudan could spread beyond borders'

The war in Sudan could spread beyond the northeast African country's borders if it is not stopped, Sudan's army chief told the United Nations General Assembly, while urging world paramilitary force as a terrorist

group.
"The nature of this war is now a threat to regional and international peace and security. ... This is like the spark of war, a war that will spill over to other countries in the region," Sudan's Army Chief Gen. Abdel Fattah Burhan told world leaders late Thursday. Sudan plunged into conflict in April when long-simmering tensions escalated between the military, led by Gen. Burhan, and the rival Rapid Support Forces, commanded by Mohamed Hamdan Dagalo. Both had joined forces in 2021 to seize power in a coup that cast aside Sudan's prodemocracy forces. The conflict has killed at

least 5,000 people and wounded 12,000 others, according to Volker Perthes, the U.N. envoy in the country, who announced

Gen. Burhan said the Sudanese military has "knocked (on) all doors to stop this war" and asked the U.N. to designate the RSF as a terrorist group. The RSF, he said, has committed "all sorts of crimes that give grounds ing receiving the help of "outlaws and terrorist groups" from other countries.

Those who have supported killing, burning, raping, forced displacement, looting, stealing, torture, trafficking of arms and drugs, bringing mercenaries or recruiting children all such crimes necessitate accountability and punishment," Burhan said. Both the Sudanese military and the RSF have been accused by Amnesty International of extensive war crimes, including deliberate killings of civilians and mass sexual assault. At least 4.6 million people have been displaced in the fighting, according to U.N. data. 

Ukrainian missile strike hits Pope visits multicultural Marseille Russia's Black Sea Fleet HQ

Ukraine carried out a fiery missile strike on Friday on the main headquarters of Russia's Black Sea Fleet and one serviceman was missing, the Russian Defence

Photos and video showed large plumes of smoke over the building in Sevastopol in annexed Crimea.

The ministry initially said one servicemember was killed but then issued a subsequent statement saying he was missing.

The Russian-installed governor of Sevastopol, Mikhail Razvozhayev, said no one was injured outside the burning headquarters, and he didn't provide information on other casualties. Firefighters battled the blaze, and more emergency forces were being brought in, an indication the fire could be massive.

Sevastopol residents said they heard explosions in the skies and saw smoke, Russian news outlets reported. Images circulated in Ukrainian Telegram channels showed clouds of smoke over the seafront. The Associated Press could not immediately verify the videos.

A stream of ambulances arrived at the

fleet's headquarters, and shrapnel was scattered hundreds of metres (yards) around, the Tass news agency reported.

The Defence Ministry said five missiles were shot down by Russian air defense systems responding to the attack on Sevastopol. It was not immediately clear if the headquarters was hit in a direct strike or by debris from an intercepted missile.

Oleg Kryuchkov, an official with the Crimean administration, said one cruise missile downed near Bakhchysarai, about 30 kilometres (18.5 miles) inland, sparked Razvozhayev said civilian infrastruc-

ture wasn't damaged but did not mention the impact on the fleet headquarters. He initially warned Sevastopol residents that another attack was possible and urged them not to leave buildings or go to the city centre.

He later said there was no longer any threat of an air strike but reiterated calls not to go to the central part of the city, saying roads were closed and and unspecified "special efforts" were underway.

Police asked residents to leave the central part of the city, Tass said. Ukrainian officials, who have claimed responsibility

for a series of other recent attacks on Crimea, didn't immediately announce Kyiv launched the strike.

The attack comes a day after Russian missiles and artillery pounded cities across Ukraine, killing at least five people as President Volodymyr Zelenskyy met with President Joe Biden and congressional leaders in Washington with an additional USD 24 billion aid package being considered.

The port city of Sevastopol serves as the main base for Russia's Black Sea Fleet. A Ukrainian drone hit the fleet's headquarters in July 2022, injuring six people and causing minor damage to the building.

Last week, the Russian-installed

authorities in the city accused Ukraine of attacking a strategic shipyard in the city, damaging two ships undergoing repairs and causing a fire at the facility. The Crimean Peninsula, which Russia

annexed from Ukraine in 2014 in an act that most of the world considered illegal has been a frequent target since Russian President Vladimir Putin ordered a fullscale invasion of Ukraine more than 18 months ago. The attack on the shipyard was the biggest in weeks.

Pope Francis arrived on Friday in the French port city of Marseille, for centuries a multiethnic and multifaith melting pot, to amplify his call for the Mediterranean to be a place of welcome for migrants, not a cemetery for people who die trying to cross the sea to Europe. French Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne awaited the pope on the airport tarmac for the arrival ceremony.

His two-day visit comes as Europe is again seeing an increasing number of people who set off in flimsy boats from Tunisia for Italy.

Speaking to reporters on the plane en route to Marseille, Francis was asked about the recent influx of migrants to the Italian island of Lampedusa, where the thousands of people who arrived last week briefly outnumbered the island's resident population.

"Cruelty, a lack of humanity. A terrible lack of humanity," Francis said. The pope's position on migration is an increasingly lonely one in Europe, where some countries



are emphasising border fences, repatriations and the possibility of a naval blockade to keep new influx of would-be refugees out. Francis is presiding over

the closing session of a gathering of Mediterranean Catholic bishops, but his two-day visit to Marseille is aimed at sending a message well beyond the Catholic faithful to Europe, North Africa and beyond.

After a prayer at the southern French city's basilica, Francis is scheduled to hold an interfaith prayer at a monument dedicated to those who have died at sea. The UN's International Organisation for

than 28,000 Europe-bound migrants have died since 2014 while attempting to cross the Mediterranean.

Francis, who has long lamented that the Mediterranean Sea has become "the world's biggest cemetery," confirmed his visit months ago, but it comes as Italy is again seeing an increasing number of migrant arrivals.

Italian Premier Giorgia Meloni resurrected calls for a naval blockade and announced new centers to hold those who don't qualify for asylum until they can be sent home.

France, for its part, beefed up patrols at its southern border with Italy, a few hours' drive from Marseille, and increased drone surveillance of the Alps to keep newcomers from crossing over. With a European Parliament election set for next year and France's far right challenging the centrist government's policies, French government officials stood firm. "France will not take in migrants from Lampedusa," Interior Minister Gerald

"It's not by taking in more people that we're going to stem a flow that obviously affects our ability to integrate" them into French society, he said. Marseille's archbishop,

Cardinal Jean-Marc Aveline, who was born in Algeria and moved to France as a child, said such "aggressive" measures weren't the answer. But he said "naive" and peacenik speeches about everyone living together happily ever after weren't helpful either.

Índia had designated Nijjar as a terrorist in 2020.

India angrily rejected the allegations as "absurd" and "motivated" and expelled a senior Canadian diplomat in a tit-for-tat move to Ottawa's expulsion of an Indian official over the case.

Azerbaijan sends food, other aid to Nagorno-Karabakh

Azerbaijan said it was delivering food and other humanitarian aid to Nagorno-Karabakh on Friday, two days after the region's ethnic Armenian separatist government called a cease-fire in a short but intense fight with Azerbaijani forces.

But the aid will be only a slight relief to the region that has endured severe food and medicine shortages since last December, an ordeal now aggravated by thousands who fled the recent fighting without being able to take food with them. Nagorno-Karabakh's 120,000 people began suffering shortages late last year when a blockade began of the road connecting the region to Armenia.

Improving the supply of food and other basic needs will be a key issue in building stability in the region, which is within Azerbaijan but had been

under the control of ethnic Armenian forces since 1994.

Azerbaijan on Tuesday launched intense fire on Armenian positions in what it called an "anti-terrorist operation," demanding that the Armenians lay down their arms and the separatist government disband.

A day later, Nagorno-Karabakh authorities agreed to the military demands, but talks on how the region will be reintegrated into Azerbaijan have not reached final agreement.

Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan on Friday said at a government meeting that there was no immediate need for the region's ethnic Armenians to leave their homes, but said Armenia is prepared to receive as many as 40,000 evacuees if needed.

Anxiety is high among the region's people. "The majority of the pop-

ulation wants to be evacuated

to Armenia. We cannot live with Azerbaijan," 21-year-old Hayk Harutunyan said in Stepanakert, the regional capi-

"During the last 30 years thousands of Armenians were killed, our brothers and sisters," he told The Associated Press by telephone, referring to decades of conflict over the region.

"Azerbaijan's goal is the annihilation of the Armenian nation; how can we live with those who want to kill us?"

Harutunyan said "the whole city is full of refugees brought from those regions ... that came under the control of Azerbaijan after the September 19 attack. These people left their homes empty-handed, they had no food, no clothes, no place to

the government on Friday informed IT hardware players that the process of import authorisation for laptops, tablet, servers etc, will be completely online and has sought data of the past three years for the inbound shipments of mobile, IT and telecom products, sources aware of the development said.

Industry players have been informed that the "import management system" portal, which will be managed by Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), will go live by the end of this month.

"MeitY has informed companies that 'import man-agement system' will go live by September end. It will be managed by DGFT. It has asked importers to feed their organisation data and import data subsequently for the past 3 years," a source, who did not wish to be identified, told

The government has proposed to implement new rules for import of IT hardware from November 1. The new rule will allow imports of IT hardware by authorised firms.

The import management system will handle imports related to mobile phones, IT and tele-



The import authorisation will be processed completely online without any manual interventions for speedy approval," an industry source

The authorisation will be initially granted for about a year, after which there will be gradual reduction of 5 per cent on import quota of finished products.

"There may be conditional relief on import quota on a case to case basis," the industry source said.



Paris Olympics berths up for grabs at Asian Games boxing

 □lyweight world champion Hasan Γ boy Dusmatov will be one of the favourites for gold when boxing gets under way at the Asian Games on Sunday, with qualification for the

Paris Ólympics also up for grabs. The 30-year-old Uzbek was Olympic champion in 2016 and in Hangzhou will be seeking the one gold medal absent from his collection in the 51kg division.

His first bout will be on Monday, with gold and silver medallists in the seven men's weight divisions all guaranteed a place at next summer's Paris Olympics. In the women's competition, 20 Paris berths can be won in Hangzhou.

Dusmatov was stunned in the 2018 Asian Games final by Amit Panghal in a massive upset, but the Indian is a notable absentee this time.

Another hoping to turn 2018 silver into gold is middleweight (71kg) world champion Aslanbek Shymbergenov from Kazakhstan.

Shiva Thapa, a winner at the 2013

Asian Championships, will lead the Indian squad in Panghal's absence.

light flyweight (50kg) Thi Tam Nguyen has recovered from a torn knee ligament suffered at the SEA Games earlier this year and will lead a nine-strong Vietnam team.

The world championships silver

medallist has already secured her place at Paris and will become the first Vietnamese boxer to take part in two consecutive Olympics.

She could again come up against India's multiple world champion Zareen Nikhat, who beat the Vietnamese by unanimous decision to lift the world title in New Delhi earlier this year. Nikhat also won gold in the 2022 world championships in Istanbul in the 52kg category

Asian Games: Chance for Chopra-led India to showcase its sporting prowess

Led by Olympic champion Neeraj Chopra, India will seek to showcase its ascendency as a sporting power at the Asian Games, which opens formally on Saturday after an unprecedented one-year delay due to the COVID-19 pandem-

India will hope to surpass the 70 medals (16 gold, 23 silver and 31 bronze) won in 2018 in Indonesia with largest contingent of 655 athletes competing in 39 sports in Hangzhou to show the world the rapid strides the country has made in sports since the historic performance in Tokyo Olympics in 2021.

India have not finished in the top-5 in medal tally standings since the 1986 edition in Seoul. For the first time in the Asian Games history, India will be having five Olympic medallists in their ranks led by javelin superstar Chopra, who will be defending his title, raising hopes of the country grabbing more gold medals than the 16 won in 2018.

The other Olympic medallists are weightlifter Mirabai Chanu, shuttler PV Sindhu, wrestler Bajrang Punia and boxer Lovlina Borgohain.

Still, it is difficult to predict the gold medal count for India. Sindhu has been struggling for some time, Chanu has had fitness issues recently while Bajrang started training only a few months ago after taking part in the wrestlers' protest.

Borgohain and Chopra have, though, become world champions recently. Borgohain will also shoulder the responsibility of being the Indian contingent flag-bearer during the opening ceremony on Saturday along with the men's hockey te-

The eight-gold show in ath-letics in 2018 will be hard to repeat but hockey (men and

women), kabaddi (men and women), chess and archery can swell India's yellow metal tally. Going by current form,

India can win gold in both men's and women's hockey competitions. India can also win a gold each in men's and women's kabaddi and make amends for missed chance in Jakarta. The men's team had won a bronze and the women's settled for a silver last time.

Shooters had given nine medals in 2018, including two gold, but they may not be abe to surpass the tally this time.

In boxing, the likes of Nikhat Zareen and Borgohain are favourites to win a medal but it is difficult to predict the colour. The same is the case with the wrestlers who had won three medals, including two gold, in 2018.

By hosting the world's biggest multi-sporting event, China is heralding its opening from the pandemic, a giant competition which will be the biggest ever in its history.

No doubt the Olympics is the pinnacle of multi-sporting event in the world but more athletes compete in the Asian

Games, with over 12,000 taking

part in Hangzhou. The 19th edition of the continental showpiece, which will run till October 8 in Hangzhou and five co-host cities of Huzhou, Ningbo, Shaoxing, Jinhua and Wenzhou, was to be held in September 2022 but was postponed by a year after a surge

of COVID-19 cases in China.

Forty-five nations and territories in Asia will compete for 481 gold medals from 40 sports and 61 disciplines, including Esports which is making its debut in the Asian Games. Competitions in football, volleyball, cricket, rowing, sailing and modern pentathlon began before the grand opening cere-

China are fielding their second-largest contingent in their Asian Games history with 886 athletes, including 437 women, taking part in Hangzhou. It is 91 less than the 977 athletes China fielded at the 2010 Guangzhou

China are not only fielding

the most number of athletes in this edition of the Games but

they are also set to continue their domination by bagging the top spot in the medal tally, which they have been doing at every edition since 1982 with several Olympic champions participating. South Korea are sending their largest ever athletes' contingent of 867 with an aim to finish second in the medal tally.

The Asian Games are expected to be declared opened by Chinese president Xi Jinping Organisers have already pent about 10.2 billion yuan

(USD 1.4 billion) on venues for competitions and training, according to reports. Hangzhou is the third Chinese city to hold the Asian

Games, after Guangzhou_in 2010 and Beijing in 1990. The Chinese capital has also hosted the Summer and Winter Olympics.
All the venues will use green

electricity as the goal is to host a carbon-neutral and green Asian Games.

Five-star Shami, classy Shubman set up Indian victory

ohammed Shami's crafty bowling performance was beautifully complemented by the grace and poise of Shubman Gill as India defeated Australia by five wickets in the opening ODI of the three-match series here on Friday

Shami displayed his artistry with impressive figures of 5 for 51, reminding all and sundry of his skills while helping India restrict Australia to 276 after asking the visitors

to 2/6 after asking the visitors to make first use of the strip.

In reply, Gill once again stamped his authority with a 63-ball 74 and added 142 for the opening stand with the Asian Games-bound Ruturaj Gaikwad (71 off 77 balls) to set the foundation for victory. set the foundation for victory, which, on paper, might have looked a bit more stretched than it actually was.

Victory was achieved in 48.4 overs as Suryakumar Yadav (50 off 49 balls) and skipper KL Rahul (58 not out off 63 balls) also played their part with only Shreyas Iyer (3) and Ishan Kishan (18) missing

out on a batting party.
Surya would especially be happy with his effort as he came in when India still needed 92 runs to win. It could have been a bit tricky but along with his skipper, the Mumbai batter showed calmness and also earned confidence with a much-needed

bowling partner. Shami didn't bowl a devas-tating spell like Siraj did in Colombo last week, but considering the quality of opposition combined with sultry and unhelpful conditions for fast bowling in Chandigarh, this spell was as lethal, if not more.

Siraj knew it more than anyone else as to what Shami had done for the team.

"We enjoy each other's success a lot. We have spent the last so many years together and this is a result of the same," Shami said during a snap interview with host broadcasters Jio Cinema.

If one looked at the kind of bowling composition India played against Pakistan, it is dif-

ficult to imagine how Shami would fit in if India is playing two spinners and Hardik Pandya is the third seamer during most matches.

It is also impossible in Indian conditions for any pacer to play 11 games in the World Cup (if India reaches final) in six weeks, including travel, but Shami cooling his heels during important games would be a important games would be a travesty as India is looking at multi-skilled cricketers, especially those who can bolster the batting. It can be very difficult to adjust being in and out of the adjust being in and out of the playing XI, but after 179 international games for India across formats in the last 10 years, Shami knows how to adjust current demands.

The first spell to David Warner, where the left-hander faced 11 balls and scored only one run, was where Shami's skills were in full bloom. It didn't matter that it wasn't a red Dukes or SG Test ball with a pronounced seam in his hands.

"When you operate with the new ball, you have the responsibility of finding the right line and length, set the tempo and that's exactly what I wanted to do today," he said.

Young pacer Naseem Shah was on Friday ruled out of the ODI World Cup due to a shoulder injury as Pakistan named their final 15-member squad for the showpiece

beginning next month. Chief Selector Inzamam ul Haq said experienced medium pacer Hasan Ali has been recalled because of the injury to Naseem.

Naseem, 20, had suffered

match against India in the Asia Cup. He has been advised to undergo surgery and is expected to recover in three to four months. Inzamam also announced

three travelling reserves -wicketkeeper-batter Mohammad Ĥaris, mystery spinner Abrar Ahmed and fast bowler Zaman Khan for the World Cup who would be considered if there were any injuries in the squad.

"I have not tried to tinker or make too many changes in the squad because this is a World Cup and we have to remember these same players have been playing together for a while now. We have opted for continuity in the team. Inzamam told the media in Lahore on Friday.

We were forced to make one change because of an unfortunate injury to Naseem Shah. We had a few injury scares in the recent Asia Cup, but I am glad to share that all the players are fully fit and are eager to perform for their country in the all-important



tournament." Giving a breakdown on the fitness of Naseem, Inzamam said: "The doctors are looking after him but what we are learning is that he might be out for a long time, not only the World

Cup."

The Chief Selector said that Naseem is also doubtful to make the tour of Australia after the World Cup.

Inzamam also defended the decision to call up Hasan Ali, who has been out with a finger injury for a while now and last played for Pakistan in any format in January this year against New Zealand in a Test match.

Hasan, who fractured his finger while playing in the Lanka Premier League a few months back, last played a ODI for Pakistan in June, 2022. "The only reason we have picked Hasan is because he is an experienced bowler who has played and bowled well before in big tournaments and matches and that is why we have gone for Hasan. He was only picked after the doctors cleared his fitness," he

There were concerns about fast bowler Haris Rauf's fitness after he missed the last Super four game against Sri Lanka following an injury during the India game.

India to open U-19 World Cup campaign against B'desh

 $F^{\rm ive\text{-}time\ winners\ and\ defend-}_{\rm ing\ champions\ India\ will}$ open their campaign at next year's U-19 World Cup against Bangladesh, the International Cricket Council (ICC) announced on Friday.

Featuring a total of 16 teams, the U-19 World Cup will be held from January 12 and 12 and 15 and 16 teams. from January 13 to February 4 in Sri Lanka, with the hosts taking on Zimbabwe in the tournament-opener in Colombo.

India are the most successing lifted the trophy on five occasions -- 1999-00, 2007-08, 2012, 2017-18 and last year in the West Indies during the 2021-22 edition. India are placed in Group A along with Bangladesh, Ireland and USA. After taking on Bangladesh on January 14, India will face the USA on January 18 and Ireland on January 20.
"The teams will be divided

into four groups, each consisting of four teams, the top three teams from each group will now progress to the Super Six stage. Group stage matches will take place from 13 to 21 January," the ICC said. "Additionally, the fourth-

placed teams in each group will compete in one more match against another fourth-placed tournament," it added.

After the conclusion of the group stage, 12 teams will move to the Super Six stage wherein they will be divided into two groups of six teams each.

Top three teams from

Groups A and D will form one group in Super Six stage and similarly, top three sides from Groups B and C will be the part

of the second group.

Based on their positions in the initial group stage, each team will play two matches in the Super Six stage against the second and third teams from the other group. "For instance, the top team in Group A (A1) will play against the second and third teams in Group D (D2 and D3). A2 will play against D1 and D3, and so forth," the ICC said while explaining the format

The two teams finishing on the top of their respective Super Six groups will make it to the semifinals, with the final to be played on February 4 at the Sinhalese Sports Club in Colombo.
