# **Hyderabad cops issue list of** restrictions for Ganesh fest

The Hyderabad police on Sunday issued a list of Dos and Don'ts ahead of Ganesh Chaturthi.

No idol shall be installed on roads and pavements. A temporary mandap should be prepared using good quality material; Playing of loud music in Ganesh pandals shall not be permitted, so that there is no disturbance to neighbours/stu-

dents/people who are unwell.

Mandap shall not be used as a place for drinking alcoholic beverages, gambling or any other unlawful and anti-social



## 7 Kakatiya Medical College students booked for ragging

Even as the incident of the suicide of first-year postgraduate student D Preethi is still fresh in people's mind, a shocking incident of ragging in Kakatiya Medical College (KMC) came to light on Sunday again in Kakatiya Medical College (KMC).

The Warangal Police registered a case against seven MBBS third-year students for allegedly ragging a second-year MBBS student in the college. The police registered

cases under various Sections of the IPC and Prohibition of Ragging Act. KMC principal D Mohan

Das reportedly inquired into the alleged ragging incident. He questioned 15 students on the incident on September 14. The next day, the student, who was allegedly subjected to ragging lodged a complaint with the police. The complaint alleged that 10 students had attacked him. The third-year students allegedly tortured the second-year student.

According to Assistant Commissioner of Police B Kishan, about seven thirdyear students ragged a secondyear student on the KMC campus on September 14. After conducting an inquiry, the police registered cases against seven students under IPC 294/b, 323, 340, and the

Prohibition Ragging Act of 1997. The case is under investigation, he said. Speaking to the media, the principal said that there was no incident of ragging at the college.

The senior students beat the junior students during a clash between the groups. However, the anti-ragging committee took a serious view of the incident and called the student groups for an inquiry. The Anti-Ragging Committee meeting would be held on September 19 to go into the incident and decide the future course of action.

Some student unions demanded suspension of the KMC principal for failing to rein in ragging in the college.



Two projects to develop devices for protecting all GPS enabled assets from jamming and identifying friendly forces during counter-terrorism operations along the LoC and hinterlands are nearing com-

pletion, officials said. Seven major projects, including these two ventures of anti-GPS jamming and Identification Friend or Foe (IFF) devices, are part of the design and development being undertaken by IIT Jammu and CST Advanced Systems Private Limited in a joint collabora-

"We have a collaboration with IIT Jammu in which we are working on six to seven

projects. Two of these projects are reaching completion," CST Advanced Systems General Manager Colonel (Retd) Anil J Alex said on Friday. He said one of the two pro-

jects reaching completion is an anti-GPS jamming device, which will "save our drones, vehicles and other GPS enabled devices from the enemy" jamming them.
The anti-GPS jamming

device is a small-sized, light weight, low powered device suitable to be retrofitted to protect any navigation system, officials said.

Colonel (Retd) Alex said the second project nearing completion is the IFF device, which will help the Army in detecting its own forces in the bat-



tlefield during counter-insurgency or counter-terrorism

operations. "It works on RF (Radio Frequency) mesh. It operates in any condition whether it is day or night, and even in bad use of GPS data, sensors and RF communications, the offi-It is aimed to identify its

own forces in conventional trans International Border (IB), Line of Control (LoC) operations and in counter terrorism operations during raids, patrols, ambushes and specialized operations, they added.

The officials said the IFF device unit can be mounted or attached to personnel, vehicles, tanks, drones and helicopters.

Colonel (Retd) Alex said the CST designs and develops communication and surveillance equipment for the forces.



# **Something special?**

Parliament's special session begins today amid speculation over its true purpose

hough Parliament's special session's date with destiny is today, the real reason for summoning it has remained shrouded in suspense ever since its announcement only days after the monsoon session. Significantly, the BJP Government had called for this special session on September 18 while everyone and everything was focused on making the G20 Summit a resounding success. This unexpected announcement drew attention from across the political spectrum, but had everyone clueless about the agenda or the Government's underlying motive. Since a special session is called only when there is an urgent, important issue, there was a lot of speculation over the issues likely to be taken up: National security to agricultural reforms to legislative initiatives. Making it more secretive, for its part, the Government did not list any business. Only days before the session's start did the Government release the agenda: There is a special discussion on our Parliament's journey of 75 years. The Government also listed the Bill on the



appointment of the Chief Election Commissioner to be taken up for consideration and passage. The other listed items for the Lok Sabha include 'The Advocates (Amendment) Bill, 2023' and 'The Press and Registration of Periodicals Bill, 2023', passed by the Rajya Sabha on August 3, 2023. Besides, 'The Post Office Bill, 2023' has been listed for the Lok Sabha. The session is likely to see the proceedings of Parliament shifting from the old building to the new on the second day.

Congress leader Jairam Ramesh has termed it "much ado about nothing" as all this business, assuming it is all, could have waited till the winter session

in November. In the absence of any suitably tangible information, meanwhile, rumours and speculation are rife. Guesses are as wide-ranging as the declaration of Emergency, a Cabinet reshuffle or early Lok Sabha elections by dissolving the House (though all these can be achieved even when Parliament is not in session). The big question remains, why was the special session called in the first place? Given the year-end Assembly polls and the 2024 general elections, it could be a strategic move by the BJP to gain political mileage. To be fair, the sitting of the two Houses provides it a platform to articulate its vision to public. Calling a special session may also help in avoiding parliamentary logjams which have routinely marked the sessions. Having said that, it still remains an unprecedented move. A special session was not called to discuss grave situations like the Coronavirus pandemic, demonetisation or the incidents of violence in Manipur. So why now? Besides, for announcing it barely two months before the scheduled start of the winter session, the Government ought to have very sound reasons, else it would set a bad precedence. The bottomline is that arbitrary moves must be avoided as these create unnecessary confusion, affecting adversely not only the electorate but also the nation's economic sentiment and growth.

# Who actually lost territory to China?




The war of 1962 exposed the inept leadership of a Prime Minister who was thoroughly alienated from the realities of both India and the geopolitics

from India's Ambassador KM Panikkar, Mao Zedong had said, "India and China cannot afford to have war. We have too many important problems to think about," and added, "China had no aggressive intentions towards any body and least of all towards India". Being a socialist, Jawaharlal Nehru, fell for Mao's sweetness in good faith. Nehru's dear friend VK Krishna Menon, whose intellect the former was in awe of, was also a communist. Menon believed that no socialist country can go to war with another such country. When General Robert Lockhart, the Commander-in-Chief of the Indian Army in the immediate years after independence, once asked Nehru as to the kind of army he envisaged for India so that he could plan accordingly, Nehru reacted sharply, "What army? India is a peace-loving country and doesn't want war. Our police is sufficient to protect us".

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's advice dated 7th November 1950, coved to be water off a duck's back. Patel had written, "We have practically been alone in championing the cause of China's entry into UN. In spite of this, China is not convinced about our disinterestedness, it continues to regard us with suspicion and the whole psychology is one, of scepticism mixed with a little hostility. In the background of this, we have to consider what new situation now faces us as a result of the disappearance of Tibet, and the expansion of China almost up to our gates".

Impervious to his colleague's advice, Nehru followed the socialist line propagated by his buddy Krishna Menon, choosing to befriend Chinese foreign minister Chou En Lai, going about warmly introducing him to his Asian counterpart heads of state and governments. The Bandung Conference of 1955 was an example when Nehru trotted around chaperoning Chou En Lai.

By the same year, Beijing (then Peking) had already built a highway connecting Tibet with



Xinjiang (then Sinkiang). When the Government of India came to know of this serious development, Nehru tried to explain it away to Parliament by stating that in Aksai Chin, "not a blade of grass grows". I wonder if Rahul Gandhi was referring to this loss of what he called "grazing land" and about which Prime Minister Modi had "not dis-

Nehru's pride did not permit him to change India's approach towards Chinese mischief although with Chou En Lai, he shifted from his charm to gradual animosity. The Chinese reacted by assaulting and killing ten Indian border patrol guards and apprehending another ten at Kongka Pass in the Tibetan region in 1959. This was the final portent, followed by Chou's visit to New Delhi in 1960, when he reportedly gave Nehru a 'final offer' of settlement: India should give up claims to Aksai Chin and China would renounce its 'rights' in Arunachal Pradesh, then called North East Frontier Agency (NEFA). The next time India and China met was on the battlefields of Ladakh in the West and Tawang in the

field. The army that was expected to fight in the mountains did not possess a single mountain howitzer. Defence minister Krishna Menon wanted the country's ordnance factories to produce civilian items like coffee percolators rather than guns and ammu-

Our jawans thus laid down their lives, having to make do with only the outdated .303 bolt action Lee Enfield rifles. aharishi Patanjali in his treatise Patanjali Yoga Sutra, wrote, Tado drashtuhu swarupe avastham, (Sutra 3), implying that the seer then rests V or remains in his/her own nature. At its core, Ashtanga Yoga is built upon a solid foundation of ethical and moral principles known as Yama and Niyama. It involves maintaining a clean physical environment, as well as purifying the mind and heart through practices such as meditation. 2.Santosha (Contentment): Santosha encourages contentment and acceptance of the present moment. It teaches us to find joy and satisfaction in what we have rather than constantly seeking external sources of happiness. 3. Tapas (Austerity): Tapas involves cultivating self-discipline and inner strength. It includes practices like fasting, self-reflection, and intense self-study to remove impurities and distractions from the mind.

# Time for 100 per cent FDI in retail sector



One hundred per cent Foreign Direct Investment should be permitted to all retailers, online or offline, big or small, for the growth of this sector

uring discussions with representatives of e-commerce firms and a domestic traders' body viz. Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT) held on August 2, 2023, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) in the Ministry of Commerce and Industry made a presentation on the 'fundamentals' of the proposed e-commerce policy. The policy is being deliberated since 2018.

The DPIIT highlighted seven salient

features of the proposed policy: unambiguous demarcation between the mar-ketplace model where foreign direct investment (FDI) is allowed and inven-tory model where FDI is prohibited; making the policy congruent with the consumer protection rules; inclusive growth of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs); enabling free and informed choice by onsumers; exports promotion; determining responsibilities of e-commerce entities; and stricter compliance to regulatory measures.

The government's main objective is to harmonize the interests of three key stakeholders viz. foreign investors, MSMEs and consumers. But, the manner in which various contours of the policy have evolved since the DPIIT made its first move on FDI in e-commerce in 2016, it is unlikely that this would hap-

E-commerce is the process of selling goods and services over the Internet. In early 2016, the government allowed 100 percent FDI under the so-called marketplace model. The marketplace is a plat-form where vendors sell their products to consumers even as its owner merely acts as a facilitator by providing services such as booking orders, raising invoices, arranging the delivery, etc. She can't hold inventory or undertake direct sell-

The policy intent was abundantly clear. The foreign investor in the marketplace wasn't supposed to invest in inventory model. The 'demarcation' between the two models was intended when DPIIT came out with its Press Note (PN) in 2016. But, a clever bureaucrat blurred this demarcation while drafting the fine print. The PN (2016) prescribed ditions. First, the foreign entity owning marketplace cannot permit more than 25 percent of total sales on the marketplace from one vendor or its group companies. Two, it cannot directly or indirectly influence the sale price.

In the absence of specifying as to who that vendor should be, it made way for a company linked to the owner of marketplace to get in. The latter could set up four companies (call them subsidiaries or JVs) and control 25 percent each of total sales on the platform. Contrary to the policy intent, which prohibited foreign investor in e-commerce, the fineprint did just the opposite.

Having allowed its entities to control almost all of the sales made on the marketplace, the second condition that the latter can't directly or indirectly influence the sale price is laughable.

The MSMEs who were impacted the most by this backdoor entry of Amazon, Walmart/Flipkart etc in direct selling complained to the government. In response, on December 26, 2018, the DPIIT clarified "the owner of the marketplace or its subsidiary or its joint ven-

ture (JV) with an Indian company can't have ownership of the seller." Further, "a seller on the platform can't source more than 25 percent of its inventory from a firm connected with the latter." It is possible for foreign investors to circumvent the first rider by having less than 50 percent share-holding in the seller firm and arguing that they have no control (majority) over the latter. The marketplace owner can also sell his 'own' product - albeit through its wholesale arm - on the platform. All that the wholesale arm needs to ensure is to restrict supplies to the seller within the 25

percent threshold. isn't just a case of boun getting blurred. The offcial notes recognize and give legitimacy to the connection between marketplace owner and the seller. These don't prohibit foreign firms from keeping inventory and engage in direct selling to consumers. They are doing it at the cost of millions of small traders. For instance, only three dozen firms out of the 400,000 sellers on the Amazon platform account for 67 percent of sales on it. In this backdrop, one wonders as to how the new policy will promote inclusive growth of MSMEs.

The government is keen on making the policy congruent with the consumer protection rules. In 2020, the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA), in the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, issued the Consumer Protection (e-commerce) Rules, under Section 101 of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019. The rules bar affiliated entities from selling

'flash sales,' and disallow sellers from using the name or brand associated with the marketplace e-commerce entities for the promotion of goods.

In 2021, DCA made amendments to restrict business-tobusiness, or B2B, sales in e-commerce and a provision to prevent an 'abuse of dominant position' by e-commerce firms. Making the new policy compati-

ble with these rules would require establishing a total disconnect between the owner of the platform and the seller on it. In other words, the government wants to undo all that was done ance to regulatory measures, to by the commerce ministry earlier. It will be tantamount to a retrospective change of policy and send a wrong signal to foreign investors. No wonder, large ecommerce companies are resisting the proposed changes.

A fourth feature of the pro-

posed policy is to enable 'free' and informed choice (albeit for consumers). This would have been possible only when a large number of entities were able to sell on the platform in a 'fair' and 'nondiscriminatory' manner. But, this isn't happening as the foreign major controls all the levers. Apart from its subsidiaries or joint ventures dominating the platform, even amongst others, the foreign firm decides as to 'who gets how much space and visibil-

As for exports promotion, the MNCs are here to avail of the ever-expanding opportunities in the Indian market and our policy makers have so far helped them by providing an enabling environ-

on e-commerce platforms, restrict ment. The talk of promoting export through this route (read: e-commerce) doesn't pass muster.

Fixing responsibilities of ecommerce entities assumes significance in the backdrop of multiple instances of consumers being duped. The foreign majors often get away from their responsibility to protect consumer by saying that they are 'intermediaries', hence they are not liable if any consumer is duped. The extant vague rules (2016/2018 press notes) enable them assume the role which suits them depending on the prevailing situation.

Finally, as for stricter compliensure this, the rules need to be crystal clear in the very first place. When, these are vague and susceptible to varied interpretations, it will be difficult to prove violation. That apart, so far the government hasn't even mooted the idea of setting up a regulatory authority.

The present mess owes it to the very idea of marketplace which is flawed. When, the government expects foreign company to do almost everything that a retailer does viz. booking order, raising invoice, arranging delivery, accept rejection and so on, how can the former deny the latter right to sell? The way forward is to shun this idea; instead allow 100 percent FDI in retail.

In fact, the bureaucrats had already done it but in a 'subtle' way. The government should make it obvious and straightforward. Moreover, 100 percent FDI should be permitted to all retailers, online or offline, big or small for a level playing field.

# India, Brazil begin talks to resolve sugar-related issue

India and Brazil have started talks to mutually resolve a sugar related trade dispute at the World Trade Organisation (WTO) and as part of the solution the South American nation may share ethanol production technology with New Delhi, an official said.

Brazil is the largest produc-er of sugarcane and ethanol in the world. It is also a leader in the technology used for ethanol production.

India is the world's second-largest producer.

Brazil, Australia and Guatemala, which are members of the WTO, had complained that India's support measures to sugarcane producers exceed the de minimis level of 10 per cent of the total value of sugarcane production, which according to them was inconsistent with the WTO's Agreement on Agriculture.



#### Sidbi to raise Rs 10,000 cr from rights issue

Small Industries Development Bank of India (Sidbi), which refinances SME loans, plans to float a Rs 10,000-crore rights issue next fiscal to expand its equity capital as it expects to grow assets to Rs 5 lakh crore by March 2024 from about Rs 4 lakh crore in March 2023, a top official has said.

The central government owns 20.8 per cent in Sidbi, while State Bank of India holds 15.65 per cent and Life Insurance Corporation 13.33 per cent. The rest of the equity is held by other public financial institutions and banks. The shareholders will subscribe to the proposed rights issue.

The lender's loan growth optimism comes from the demand for direct financing that is growing by leaps and bounds, which two years ago was only 7 per cent.

# Production of 40 C295 transport aircraft in India will be 'game-changer'

PNS ■ SEVILE (SPAIN)

The production of 40 Airbus C295 medium tactical transport aircraft in India will be a "game changer" as it would facilitate the creation of a world-class aerospace ecosystem in the country that would help in manufacturing other planes in the long-run, Indian Ambassador to Spain Dinesh K Patnaik said here.

The Indian Air Force received the first C295 aircraft on Wednesday, two years after New Delhi sealed a Rs 21,935-crore deal with Airbus Defence and Space to procure the planes.

Under the deal, Airbus will deliver the first 16 aircraft in 'fly-away' condition from its final assembly line in Seville by 2025 and the subsequent 40 aircraft will be manufactured and assembled by Tata Advanced Systems (TASL) in India as part of an industrial partnership between the

two companies. "The Ĉ295 project will be a game-changer project as it will create a world-class aerospace ecosystem in India,' Patnaik told PTI in an inter-

The first 'Make in India' C295 is set to come out of a production facility in Vadodara in September 2026 and the final aircraft is expected to be delivered to the IAF by August 2031.

It will be the first military aircraft to be produced in India by a private consortium.

Officials said India is looking at procuring more C295 aircraft to replace the Indian Air Force's ageing transport

After Airbus handed over the first plane to the IAF, Patnaik said the C295 project is not only about procurement of the aircraft but it carries much more significance in terms of the creation of an aerospace eco-system in

"We still do not have a private aerospace eco-system in India whereas all major countries have such ecosystems.

The combined market valuation of nine of the top-10 most valued firms rallied by Rs 1,80,788.99 crore last week, amid an overall buoyant trend in equities, with Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) emerging as the biggest gainer.

Last week, the BSE benchmark jumped 1,239.72 points or 1.86 per cent. The 30-share BSE Sensex rallied for the 11th day running on Friday. The 30-share BSE bench-

mark had jumped 319.63 points or 0.47 per cent to settle at a record closing of 67,838.63 on Friday.

During the day, it rallied 408.23 points or 0.60 per cent to hit its fresh all-time intra-day high 67,927.23.

Hindustan Unilever Limited was the only laggard from the top-10 pack. The list of winners had Reliance Industries Limited, TCS, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank, Infosys, ITC, State Bank of India, Bharti Airtel and Bajaj Finance.

Rover Sport models.
The MLA platform gives the company the flexibility to produce ICE, hybrid, and BEV Range Rovers as required, tailored to meet the demands of different markets, Amba noted.

# Diesel sales fall in September, petrol consumption up



PNS NEW DELHI

Diesel sales in India fell for the second straight month in September as rains dampened demand and slowed industrial activity in some parts of the country, preliminary data of state-owned firms showed.

While diesel sales by three state-owned fuel retailers fell year-on-year in the first half of September, petrol sales were up marginally.

Consumption of diesel, the most consumed fuel in the country accounting for about two-fifths of the demand, fell 5.8 per cent to 2.72 million tonnes between September 1 and 15, compared to the yearago period. Consumption had fallen by a similar proportion

in the first half of August. Month-on-month sales were up 0.9 per cent, when compared with 2.7 million tonnes of diesel consumed in the first half of August.

Diesel sales typically fall in lower demand in the agriculture sector which uses the fuel for irrigation, harvesting and transportation. Also, rains slow vehicular movements.

Consumption of diesel had

soared 6.7 per cent and 9.3 per cent in April and May, respectively as agriculture demand picked up and cars yanked up air-conditioning to beat the summer heat. It started to taper in the second half of June after the monsoon set in. It fell in the first half of July but picked up in the second fortnight of that month.

Petrol sales were up 1.2 per cent to 1.3 million tonnes in the first fortnight of September, when compared with the same period last year.

Consumption had dropped 10.5 per cent in the first fortnight of July but picked up in the latter half. It had fallen by 8 per cent in the first half of August. Sales in the first half of September were up 8.8 per cent month-on-month, the data showed.

India's economy has demonstrated remarkable resilience and is likely to have surpassed the performance of most major economies during the first half of 2023. This is helping fuel demand grow.

#### **NCLAT says IBC** not a recovery mechanism

PNS NEW DELHI

The Insolvency & Bankruptcy Code is "not a recovery mechanism", observed the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal, while dismissing a plea against United Teleco Ltd filed by one of its operational creditors. This is the second such observation from the Chennai bench of the insolvency appellate tribunal this month, after declining to entertain the petition from operational creditors.

Earlier, it had refused to entertain an insolvency petition against Wipro Ltd after observing that the bankruptcy law cannot be used as a means to recover debt against solvent companies.

# UK start-up using AI to transform services

PNS ■ LONDON

An Indian entrepreneur's new start-up is sparking worldwide investor interest as among the first companies of its kind globally to offer consumers the option to book plumbers, electricians and other services using its unique conversational artificial intel-

ligence (AI) software. Opened for a funding round recently, Anuj Gupta's Green Van uses a simple WhatsApp interface. It is designed as an Amazon of Services' offering that intends to transform the way people book essential tasks online.

It was born out of Gupta's own experience of relocating from the US to the UK around five years ago and finding the experience of sourcing reliable trade people a rather cumbersome wordof-mouth process.

"We were often left in the lurch when chasing trades people and were hit with a system that was too idiosyncratic," Gupta, in his mid-40s, told PTI in an interview.

"As I delved deeper into the industry, I could only find more and more problems largely because 87 per cent of it was driven by mom-andpop shops which is classicaly one owner and one or two members of staff. It's very, very fragmented, more so than even the mini cab industry in the pre-Uber days," he

His research showed that he had hit upon a highly lucrative marketplace with immense profits, despite all the inefficiencies. In the UK, it is estimated as a USD 120 billion market with USD 20 billion of profits, he said.

# SBI to send chocolates to borrowers who may default

The nation's largest lender State Bank of India is adopting a novel way to ensure timely repayments, especially by its retail borrowers, by greeting those likely to default on monthly installments with

a pack of chocolates. According to the bank, it has been found that a borrower who is planning to default will not answer a reminder call from the bank. So the best way is to meet them at their homes unannounced.

The move, aimed at ensuring better collections, comes amidst rising level of retail

lending in the system coupled with increasing delinquency levels on the back of the upward movement in the interest rates.

SBI's retail loan book grew over 16.46 per cent to Rs 12,04,279 crore in the June 2023 quarter from Rs 10,34,111 crore in the year-ago period, making it the largest asset class for the lender whose total book stood at Rs 33,03,731 crore, growing at 13.9 per cent on-year.

In fact for the entire system, the double-digit loan growth of around 16 per cent has been led by retail loans only.

"It was a great performance, especially to come and play like that in a final. Shows the mentality of the team. Very clinical. A performance like that will be cherished for a very long time," Rohit said at the post-match presentation ceremony.

However the skipper was astonished to see the kind of movement that his bowlers, especially Siraj, got off the sur-

"Our seamers are actually working really hard for many years, so it's pleasing for the side to see them get rewarded like that. I never thought the ball was going to be doing that much," the skipper said.

The conditions must have been helpful but it also takes high level of skill to put up a performance like that in a summit

"Again, it comes back to the skill-set of individuals. That's

very rare, you don't see many guys (like Siraj), who can move it in the air and off the pitch. And the other guys also who took part at various stages, they

all played their part." With three match series against Australia and two more warm-up games before the World Cup opener, Rohit feels that the team is moving in the right direction.

'We took all we can from this series, quite pleasing to move in this direction with this kind of confidence."

#### SHREYAS 99% FIT

India captain Rohit Sharma on Friday said left-arm spinner Axar Patel is likely to miss the first two ODIs against Australia next week while middle-order batter Shreyas Iyer is "99 percent" match-fit.

Axar had suffered a left quadriceps strain during the inconsequential Super 4 match against Bangladesh on Friday and was ruled out of the Asia Cup. Washington Sundar was drafted in as Axar's replacement

Zampa took two more wickets in the 48th over to finish with three for 71.

# **Brook replaces Roy in England's ODI WC squad**

ason Roy has been axed from England's World Cup squad, with Harry Brook drafted in in his place, after the selectors made a dramatic late amendment to their 15-man squad for the tournament in India which gets underway in just under three weeks' time.

Roy, 33, was an integral member of the England squad that won the World Cup in 2019, and had been named in England's provisional squad for the defence of their title, ahead of their four-match series against New Zealand this month.

However, he was unable to feature in any of the four games after suffering a series of back



spasms. In his absence, Roy's rival for the opener's role, Dawid Malan, made an unequivocal case for a starting role in the tournament, finishing as Player of the Series with 277 runs at 92.33 in three games, including a matchwinning century at Lord's.

Consequently, it will be Malan and Jonny Bairstow who will open the batting for England when their tournament gets underway against New Zealand on October 5.

# **Australia ODIs crucial for Shreyas, Surya**
