NIA tightens noose on Khalistanis

 $I_{against}^{n}$ a multi-State clampdown against Khalistanis and the terrorists-gangsters-drug smugglers syndicate, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Wednesday conducted synchronised raids in several places and detained a number of suspects linked to Canada-based "listed terrorist" Arsh Dalla and his cohorts, including dreaded gangsters. Dalla is operating his cartel through a network of gangsters in India

A total of 53 locations were raided during the daylong operation, which started early on Wednesday. State Police forces provided the necessary support and assistance in the raids.

The search operation spanned the six States of Punjab, Delhi, Harvana, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand and the Union Territory of Chandigarh.

During the raids, the NIA seized pistols, ammunition, large numbers of digital devices and incriminating materials. Besides Arsh Dalla, others

covered in the NIA raids are notorious gangsters Lawrence Bishnoi, Sukha Duneke, Harry Maur, Narender alias Lali, Kala Jatheri and Deepak Tinu among others.

The searches follow a recent intelligence input against gangster Lawrence Bishnoi, a criminal mastermind with a notorious track record, who has

been linked to several highprofile crimes, including the murder of renowned Punjabi singer Sidhu Moosewala and threats issued against Bollywood actors Salman Khan, officials said.

Recent intelligence inputs suggest an alarming develop-ment in Bishnoi's illicit activities suggesting he has established a direct line of communication with Nasir Khan, an operative of Pakistan Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI).

The connection suggests that Bishnoi and his gang might be diversifying their criminal portfolio by procuring weapons with the help of Pakistan Intelligence Operatives (PIOs) and making use of these weapons for furthering gangster activities in the region," reads the Intelligence report.

Bishnoi's gang is notorious for involvement in extortion and killings but the recent revelation of links with Pakistanbased entities suggests a "strategic shift in the gang's operational focus."

'The gang's involvement in arms smuggling represents a significant escalation in their criminal activities and poses a considerable risk to the nation's security. The potential backing by Pakistan ISI operatives also indicates a concerning overlap between organised crimes and geopolitical adversaries, enhancing the threat profile of Bishnoi's operations," the report

es were the seventh in the series of such crackdowns launched by NIA following the registration of five cases since August 2022, including the two new cases registered against Organised Criminal Gangs in July 2023. The cases relate to conspiracies of targeted killings, terror funding of pro-Khalistan outfits and extortion by the gangsters, many of whom are lodged in various jails or are operating from various foreign countries, including Canada, Pakistan, Malaysia, Portugal and Australia and the United States among others,

"The focus of today's raids, aimed at dismantling the terror-gangster-drug smuggler nexus, was on weapon suppliers, financiers and logistics providers associated with various hardcore gangs and their operatives. These gangs are working with drug smugglers and terrorists based out of other countries, including Pakistan, the UAE, Canada, Portugal, etc," the NIA said in a statement.

NIA investigations so far have revealed that the conspiracies under investigation were being hatched in jails of different States and were being executed by an organised network of operatives based abroad. Notable among such conspiracies were the sensational killing of Maharashtra builder Sanjay Biyani, mining trader Mehal Singh and international Kabaddi player Sandeep Nangal Ambia in Punjab last

Many of the criminals and gangsters who were earlier leading gangs in India have fled abroad in recent years and are now pursuing their terror and violence related activities from there, the NIA probe has unraveled.

Extrajudicial killing is not India's policy: Jaishankar

Tn the wake of Canada's alle-**⊥**gations about India's "potential" involvement in the killing of a Khalistani separatist on its soil, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has said that New Delhi conveyed to Ottawa that it is not the Government of India's policy and it is open to looking at "specific" and "relevant" information in the case.

Jaishankar made the comments in a conversation at the Council on Foreign Relations in New York on Tuesday after addressing the UN General Assembly session.

'Yes, I do have a comment. will share with you very frankly what we told the Canadians," Jaishankar said when asked if he had any comment on recent allegations by Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau that "agents" of the Government of India are linked to the killing of Khalistani extremist Hardeep Singh Nijjar on Canadian soil on June 18.

"One, we told the Canadians that this is not the Government of India's policy," Jaishankar said.

Two, we told the

Canadians saying that look, if you have something specific, if you have something relevant, let us know. We are open to looking at it," Jaishankar said while responding to a question from former US Ambassador to India and Distinguished Fellow Kenneth Juster, in his first public comments on the issue.

Jaishankar asserted that one must also understand the context because the "picture is not complete" without the context of it.

"You also have to appreciate that in the last few years, Canada actually has seen a lot of organised crime relating to the secessionist forces, organised crime, violence, extremism. They're all very, very

deeply mixed up," he said.
"We have actually been badgering the Canadians, we have given them a lot of information about organised crime leadership, which operates out of Canada. There are a large number of extradition requests. There are terrorist leaders who have been identified," he said, adding that one has to understand that there is an "environment out there," he said.

"That is important in a way

to factor in if you have to understand what is going on out there. And our concern is that it is really been very permissive because of political reasons. So, we have a situation where actually our diplomats are threatened, our consulates have been attacked and often comments are made about 'there is interference in our politics'. And, a lot of this is often justified as saying, well, that is how democracies work," Jaishankar said.

When asked by Juster whether the Government of India will cooperate with Canada if there are specific pieces of evidence provided to it, Jaishankar said, "If somebody gives me something specific, it doesn't have to be restricted to Canada, but if there is any incident which is an issue and somebody gives me something specific, as a government I would look at it. Of course, I would look at it."

When asked about reports that intelligence about the killing was shared amongst the Five Eyes, Jaishankar said, 'I'm not part of the Five Eyes. I'm certainly not part of the FBI. You are asking the wrong

Earlier, the triumvirate of Bhaker, Esha and Rhythm Sangwan fired in tandem to shoot the gold medal in the women's 25m pistol team event, as Indian shooters dominated proceedings at the Hangzhou Shooting Range Hall.

In the day's last shooting final, Anant Jeet Singh Naruka claimed the silver medal in

Naruka finished his last round with 10/10 to end his event with an impressive 58/60 but it was still not good enough for gold as Kuwait's Abdullah Alrashidi equalled the world record with a perfect 60/60 to finish on top of the podium.

Nasser Al-Attiya of Qatar bagged the bronze with 46. Manu, Esha and Rhythm totalled 1759 to finish on top of the podium and help the country clinch its fourth gold medal in the ongoing sporting extravaganza. This was the second gold medal for India in shooting in these Games.

Canada's weird reasons on India travel advisory

During Justin Trudeau's tenure, Canada has taken a diplomatic disagreement with India to an unprecedented The Canadian Government has provided peculiar explanations to its citizens, urging them to exercise caution when visiting India.

The reasons — strange and exaggerated — include extreme weather conditions, frequent train accidents, forced marriages, incidents of rape and sexual assaults in yoga centres and ashrams, as well as the overall poor road conditions across the country.

This travel demarche has been issued at a time when India and Canada find themselves entangled in a diplomatic dispute over the killing of Khalistani terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar in Canada.

Forced marriage affecting foreigners occurs, sometimes without the affected person's prior knowledge or consent and some Canadians have been forced into marital arrangements and have been detained against their will," reads the

"They have been subjected to threats, intimidation and violence by family members," claimed the advisory uploaded on Canada's official website travel.gc.ca.

Highlighting women's safety issue, it warned that reports of rape and assault against foreign women have increased. "You should be particularly vigilant in Delhi, Goa, and at

yoga centres, ashrams and other places of spiritual retreats. If you are travelling to India to meet someone you have otherwise only met online, you may be the victim of a scam," it

warned "Be alert to attempts at fraud by persons who profess friendship or romantic interest over the internet," it said.

"Crimes committed against women frequently occur in India. Foreign women are often the target of unwanted attention. Staring, verbal abuse, groping, and other forms of sexual harassment can occur anywhere, including in tourist sites and areas. Attackers sometimes act in a group," it said, adding, credit card and ATM frauds also occur.

According to the advisory.

India is prone to extreme weather events such as avalanches, cyclones, dust storms, earthquakes, floods, landslides and extreme temperatures that can occur in both spring and summer.

Advising people to limit their activities outdoors, the advisory said smoke haze and other types of air pollution can be extremely hazardous in urban areas and cities like Delhi.

"It is typically at its worst in winter. In rural areas, air quality can be affected by agricultural burning. Dust storms also occur across northern India," it said.

The advisory further said demonstrations/mass gatherings, general strikes, "bandh" or

"hartal," take place frequently.

"Even peaceful demonstrations can turn violent at any time. They can also lead to disruptions to traffic and public transportation. Stampedes have occurred during mass gatherings, including religious ceremonies, and resulted in deaths and injuries. Local authorities may impose curfews and other restrictions at short notice. Avoid areas where demonstrations and large gatherings are taking place," it advised.

The advisory also cautioned that road conditions and road safety are poor throughout the country. Most roads, including major high-

ways, are poorly maintained. 'There is severe traffic congestion. Driving conditions may be hazardous during the rainy season, and some roads

can become impassable. India has an extensive passenger train system. Rail accidents are common, mostly due to poor maintenance. Thefts are frequent on certain train lines,"

The advisory warns people against travelling to States like Gujarat, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's home State, Punjab and Rajasthan, which share borders with Pakistan, due to presence of "landmines".

The advisory said petty crime, such as pick-pocketing and purse snatching, is com-

"Criminals may target foreigners, especially in major cities and tourist areas. Petty crime frequently occurs on public transportation and overnight trains, it said.

However, serious crime against foreigners is less frequent, but incidents do occur, it cautioned. The Canada Government

advisory also warned that tourist areas and airports are of particular concern where scammers particularly target foreigners. Scams involving the

exportation of jewels, gemstones, carpets, and other items have occurred. Taxi drivers may approach you, offering money to export such items," it

Amid the diplomatic row over the killing of Nijjar, Canada has further updated its travel advisory for its citizens in India to "remain vigilant and exercise caution". Tensions flared between

Urgent Social Awareness Programme on Dengue

In a proactive move to address the rising concerns surrounding Dengue fever, a Social Awareness Program on Dengue was conducted at Motilal Nehru Public School. The program, aimed at students from Class IX to XII, was organized by the Health Department of Tata Steel UISL erstwhile Jusco).

The students were provided with vital information on preventive measures crucial to combat the ongoing Dengue outbreak in the city. It was emphasized that, despite the dedicated efforts of medical professionals, Dengue cases are expected to persist over the next month.

During the program, the Jusco Health officer presented survey reports indicating that while Dengue cases had seen a decrease in recent years, the tropical disease has resurged in India, reaching a five-year high. Students were advised to observe a "dry day" once a week, during which they should inspect their homes for stagnant water, as Dengue larvae tend to thrive between July and



BJP may field Central Ministers in four other States also

iven the fact that close Gcontests are expected in the upcoming Assembly polls, the BJP may strategically soon announce candidates for Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh and Telangana with "surprise" inclusions in line with Madhya Pradesh Assembly list.

The BJP's move to field three Union Ministers and several senior Members of Parliament in the upcoming Madhya Pradesh Assembly elections may be repeated in the four other State Assembly polls, including Rajasthan, where the BJP hopes to cash in on "anti-incumbency" against the Ashok Gehlot-led

Rajasthan voters traditionally not repeating a gov-ernment twice has also made BJP optimistic of winning the election as it is also working hard to keep its house in order

in the desert state.

The factional division in the Rajasthan unit and former two-time Chief Minister Vijaya Raje's tug of war with Union water minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat are expected to be "neutralised" by fielding 'heavy weight' Central ministers and MPs who would impact on the assembly segments other than their own, sources said.

The entry of senior leaders in the assembly poll would also be done to positively tilt caste STs - in the state, according to

Working on the MP model, the party may include Central Minister and Jodhpur MP Shekhawat, Minister of state for law, Arjun Ram Meghwal, Rajsamand MP Diya Kumari, and Jaipur (Rural) MP Rajyavardhan Rathore.

Despite Raje wanting to be projected as the Chief Ministerial candidate, the Central leadership has made it amply clear that as in the case of Madhya Pradesh, the elections in the state will be contested under a "collective leadership" with Prime Minister Narendra Modi being the main engine of the poll cam-



paign, they said.

With the likely induction of senior leaders in the assembly fray, there could be more claimants to the CM post in Rajasthan as may be the case in Madhya Pradesh also where three top Central ministers have been fielded as assembly candidates

BJP had recently appointed Arjun Meghwal, a backward class leader, the convenor of BJP's Election Manifesto committee, for Rajasthan.

In Madhya Pradesh Union Minister for agriculture, Narendra Singh Tomar, will be

contesting from Dimani; Pralhad Patel, minister of state for food processing from Narsinghpur; and minister for state for rural development, Faggan Singh Kulaste who has been given a ticket from Niwas, a seat reserved for STs.

All three are now 'competitors' to the incumbent fourtime CM Shivraj Singh Chauhan. Tomar and Kulaste have been fielded from the assembly seats won previously by the Congress. In Telangana also , MPs,

including Union Minister and State Chief GK Reddy, are expected to enter the electoral fray where BJP is seeking to be the main opposition party visà-vis the current Chief Minister Samithi, even though the Congress has now emerged as the main challenger to the ruling dispensation..

Union Minister and BJP's Rajasthan election in-charge Pralhad Joshi said his party would soon announce the list of candidates for Rajasthan but did not confirm that it may include bigwigs from the Centre.

He said that the BJP has given tickets in Madhya Pradesh to its leaders in that state but the Congress Party 'does not have a leader'. "This is the problem of the Congress

party,"he said.
"We are going to win with a huge majority in Madhya

Rahul Gandhi himself has admitted that they are losing in Rajasthan," the BJP leader said.

On Sunday, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi had said that as of now the Congress is certainly winning Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, probably winning Telangana, and there is a 'very close' contest in Rajasthan that the party believes it will be able to win.

JDIA Bloc in tatters in Bengal

Cong playing second fiddle to **BJP: TMC**

The Indian National Democratic Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) looks to be in tatters from the beginning in Bengal not only with the Left Front categorically declaring its no-truck formula with the Trinamool Congress but also the latter fighting an ongoing war of words with the primary INDIA constituent Congress accusing the tri-colour party's Bengal unit of playing second fiddle to the BJP.

A day after Chowdhury accused Mamata Banerjee of making fun trips to Spain and splurging taxpayers' money for her personal reasons at a time when Dengue was wreaking havoc in Bengal, TMC leader

and Minister Dr Shashi Panja hit back saying, "by making such statements Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury is only weakening the INDIA alliance ... I don't know whether he is hitting out

Chowdhury had earlier questioned how Banerjee paid her hotel bills in Madrid. "We have heard that the Chief Minister does not take her salary. She earns her sustenance from the sale of her books and from her paintings. If that is so then how she could afford to stay at a hotel in Madrid that costs Rs 3 lakhs per day" the Congress MP Behrampore asked.

The counterattack from Panja came hours after TMC spokesperson Kunal Ghosh attacked Chowdhury saying, "he is sounding like a BJP man ... he seems to have a plan to weaken the INDIA alliance ... by his statement it is clear that he playing the B Team of

at the Alliance itself."

Congress high command should reign in Chowdhury if they really want the Alliance to work well.

Congress leadership remained tightlipped on Bagchi who has from the very beginning protested against the Congress' joining hands with Mamata Banerjee "who has literally decimated the Congress in Bengal by engineering defections and whose goons daily attack, loot and rape our grassroots workers" the Congress odd ball said he was walking for a cause and not with any

"I have walked in a rally which has no flags ... I have no problem with Suvendu Adhikari — despite him being a BJP leader and promoting difis fighting for a cause that relates to the people," Bagchi a lawyer-turned-politician said provoking the TMC once again to draw the attention of the national leadership.

"We will expect the Congress leadership to take note of these issues in Bengal if they really are serious about the INDIA alliance," Ghosh said even as NCP leadership too asked the two parties to refrain from open war of words like this.

Meanwhile, TMC sources said that Mamata Banerjee would embark on a tour of other States beginning with Assam where she would campaign for the INDIA alliance.

According to sources TMC Assam leader Ripun Bora had a meeting with party general secretary Abhishek Banerjee where it was decided that the Bengal Chief Minister would embark on a tour of Assam in

SC tags plea seeking FIR against Udhayanidhi

The Supreme Court on Wednesday tagged a plea, which has sought registration of an FIR against Tamil Nadu Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin over his "eradicate Sanatan Dharma" remark, with another similar pending petition. A bench of justices Aniruddha Bose and Bela M Trivedi was hearing a plea seeking direction for registration of an First Information Report (FIR) against Udhayanidhi Stalin and DMK leader A Raja for their comments on Sanatan Dharma.

On September 22, the top court had agreed to hear a separate plea filed by Chennaibased lawyer B Jagannath seeking registration of an FIR against Udhayanidhi Stalin and



others over his "eradicate Sanatan Dharma" remark, which the petitioner likened to hate speech. Udhayanidhi Stalin, who is also an actor, is the son of Tamil Nadu Chief Minister and ruling DMK chief M K Stalin.

The plea filed by Delhibased advocate Vineet Jindal came up for hearing before the bench on Wednesday. "We will not issue notice but we will tag it," the bench told the counsel

appearing for the petitioner. The lawyer appearing for Tamil Nadu argued that the plea was"public interest litigation in the nature of publicity interest He said the top court had

last week issued notice on the other petition having similar prayer and there was no need to have another such plea. "Instead of taking notice, we will take it up on that day," the bench said, adding, "The question of entertaining itself, we will take it up that day". Terming it an "unfortunate scenario", the state's counsel said in this matter, several writ petitions have been filed in different high courts and it becomes difficult for the State. You have the appropriate remedy under the Constitution," the bench observed, adding, "We are only tagging it".

Centre directs banks to depute doorstep executives to help immobile pensioners

With reports of several pensioners in their late nineties, immobile or bedridden and hence facing difficulty in visiting the facilities to collect their pensions, the Centre has woken to the cause and directed the pension disbursing banks to depute doorstep executives to such pensioners submit their life certificates.

All pensioners have to give a life certificate (proof that they are alive) annually to continue receiving pension. There are about 69.76 lakh central government pensioners.

An order issued by the Department of Pension and Pensioners' Welfare (DoPPW) also asked all banks to create awareness about the convenience of obtaining the life certificate digitally by using the face authentication technology by super senior pensioners (those aged 80 and above).

In view of the digital life certificate through face authentication technology, it is now possible for every citizen to submit a digital life certificate (DLC) either from home using an Android smartphone or at the bank branch, said the order dated September 25.

"It is suggested that all



platforms for creating awareness of the convenience of obtaining a life certificate by using the face authentication technology," it said.

Banks can facilitate the submission of life certificates by deputing doorstep banking executives, said the order. They can widely publicise the methodology for submitting DLC by pasting information posters at branches and ATMs, it added.

Banks may send SMS/emails/WhatsApp messages to the pensioner with a link to the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for face authentication to empower the super senior pensioner to submit their life certificate through face authentication technology using their Android phone,

asked the banks to circulate the SOP on DLC through face authentication via email among their concerned officials to enable them to get familiar with the usage of this technology. "Necessary instructions

may be issued to all the bank branches to make suitable arrangements for submission of life certificates by the super senior pensioners/family pensioners aged 80 and above from 1st October of every year," the order said.

The Centre had in 2019 asked banks to allow senior pensioners aged 80 and above to give their life certificates with effect from October 1 every year instead of November. The remaining pensioners below the age of 80 years have to give their life certificate in



Chhattisgarh Government withdraws plea challenging ED's action against officials

The Chha Chhattisgarh Wednesday withdrew from the Supreme Court its plea challenging on the ground of jurisdiction the Enforcement Directorate's action against State Government officials in money laundering case. The money laundering case lodged in 2022 stems from an FIR registered on a complaint by the Income Tax department over allegations of illegal collection of levy on coal as well as attempts to influence public servants through corrupt means in Chhattisgarh.

The ED charged a "massive scam" took place between 2019 and 2021 in coal transportation in Chhattisgarh as part of which a "cartel" of politicians, officers and others was allegedly running a parallel system of extorting illegal levy. In its plea, the Chhattisgarh Government argued that the ED, on the basis of the FIR lodged in Bengaluru, registered an Enforcement Case Information Report (ECIR) in

Raipur on September 29, 2022

and started an investigation against State Government officials.

Chhattisgarh standing counsel Sumeer Sodhi told a bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and SVN Bhatti on Wednesday he has instructions to withdraw the plea. The bench allowed the State Government to withdraw the petition and recorded Sodhi's submission. The petition demanded the court to declare the ED's action illegal, without jurisdiction and unconstitu-The State Government

had earlier this year filed a suit challenging the constitutional validity of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) alleging that central investigating agencies are being misused to "intimidate, harass and disturb" the normal functioning of the non-BJP State Government.

The Bhupesh Baghel-led Congress government filed the original suit challenging the law under Article 131 of the Constitution which empowers a state to move the Supreme Court directly in matters of dispute with the Centre or any other State.

UP Board disposes of 59,860 correction-related complaints

Taking a stand

S Jaishankar gives a befitting reply to the Canadian tirade at a world forum meeting

epeated verbal volleys by Canada Prime Minister Justin Trudeau without putting forth any tangible proof on the table have finally forced India to indulge in some hard, plainspeak. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar took diplomacy to another nuanced level when he forcefully articulated his reply to Trudeau's allegation that India was behind the killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, a pro-Khalistan Canadian citizen of Indian descent. Already making a name for himself in some straight talk, Jaishankar's measured statement charged Trudeau's Government with harbouring extremists in Canada and not taking any action against them. Speaking at a Council on Foreign Relations event in New York, the Minister said: "Canada has seen a lot of organised crime relating to secessionist forces, organised crime and violent extremism." However, Jaishankar declined to reveal if Canada had handed over any intelligence linking Indian officials to Nijjar's death in a firing incident. After the killing and Trudeau's statement in Canadian



Parliament about India's involvement, their bilateral relations are at an all-time low. The Canadian Government, in a kneejerk reaction, identified and expelled an Indian diplomat. Without giving any name, India also sent back a Canadian diplomat. But then Jaishankar said in unequivocal terms that Indian diplomats in Canada were being threatened. Obviously, it is a matter of grave concern for India and political expediency should be the criterion to deal with such situations. "Our concern is that the Trudeau Government has been very permissive because of political reasons. So we have a situation where our diplomats are threatened," he said in New York.

Jaishankar has employed a multipronged approach to deal with the crisis in which India has to come clean on the alleged extrajudicial killing. He made it known that India does not have such a policy and, two, if Canada has any intel, it should be shared with Indian authorities. He has also tried to rope in the United Nations, talking about India's position at length and asking the world body to be more broad-based so the countries could effectively use it to air their grievances. He also warned nations (read Canada) that "political convenience" must not determine responses to terror or violence. "Respect for territorial integrity and non-interference in internal affairs cannot be exercised in cherry-picking," Jaishankar told the UNGA. "When reality departs from the rhetoric, we must have the courage to call it out.... This is very much the sentiment of the Global South," he added. Indeed, Jaishankar is the best person to plead India's case. It is time to do some plain talking with Canada, which has harboured anti-India elements for long and ignored all Indian requests to act against them. Nijjar's case, though unfortunate, presents an opportunity to air India's concerns about the anti-India campaigns being carried out in Europe and America by rogue elements while the Governments there look the other way on the pretext of supporting human rights and freedom.



Compromising the 'normalcy' of secrecy

The double standards of Canadian morality are evident as it is the same country that celebrated the neutralising of the likes of Ayman al-Zawahiri

ll countries, including moral democracies, have spy agencies and their infrastructure embedded in officialdom. These are vital towards ensuring the safety, security and mitigation of increasingly asymmetric threats. India has some like the Research Analysis Wing (RAW), and Canada, its Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS), and there is nothing abnormal or extraordinary about the same. Their mandate entails the collection, analysis, and timely warning with data to support the larger national security outlook, and therefore the means to achieve the same could be both. overt and covert. Part of the mandate also includes counterintelligence (defence against spy agencies from other countries, including 'friendly' countries), counterterrorism and conducting operations, across seas. It is par for the course and there are certain unsaid and inviolable 'redlines' and tolerances afforded on the same, especially amongst 'friendly' countries.

Beyond the one-upmanship and naivety postured by Ottawa, it is the unprecedented compromise of the established (though unsaid) norms of reciprocal secrecy between 'friendly' nations, that is simply unwarranted. Under this accepted and respected norm between two 'friendly' nations, certain officials of various security backgrounds knowingly operate in the official Embassies/Consulates, as part of the overall diplomatic mission. While there could be topical issues of bilateral disagreement, but never is the lid on such specialist security personnel, never blown. It is the nature of the domain that mutual confidentiality is always maintained as one inadvertent leak on the identity of the personnel is professional invalidation, forever. While this reciprocal accommodation may not be tolerated between traditionally 'enemy' countries e.g., Pakistan and India, it is certainly to be expected between Canada and India, whose strategic interests ought to (and did) converge, naturally. wounded history of the bombing of Air India Flight 182, in June 1985. A public inquiry conducted by the retired judge of the Canadian Supreme Court, John Major, had held Ottawa's security infrastructure lacking the requisite urgency about a threat perception, that it did not purportedly under-stand. Canada's security apparatus had bungled the case of the principal terror accused, Talwinder Singh Parmar.

Even now, the fringe elements in Canada had not only upped the ante of civil protests but had gone as far as releasing photos of Indian Embassy staffers, in a 'wanted' style optic that had compromised on safety of the Indian Embassy staffers. This should have been reason enough for Trudeau to understand the Indian concern, as opposed to indulging in grandstanding, as he chose. The land of Bundelkhand district, especially south-eastern Bundelkhand, is full of hills, plateaus, slopes, high and low, rocky, rocky, rocky and dry forests. Rain water does not stagnate on the land of this region, due to which there was always a shortage of water in Bundelkhand. In Bundelkhand, which has a population of around 1.25 crores, getting drinking water is a daily struggle for many people, especially women. Dhanwantari, a resident of Mahoba district of the district, gets emotional while saying this and says that the hand pump installed near the house did not work, even though water came after a lot of hard work, it was dirty. Therefore, she used to go about one and a half kilometres away from home to fetch water.

Whereas in ancient times, the Chandelas, Bundelas, Gond kings and Marathas along with the British had constructed more than 4,000 ponds in total in this waterscarce Bundelkhand region. Most of the ponds have dried up. However, the remaining water sources are proving to be a boon for this area today.

The Jal Jeevan Mission Scheme of the Uttar Pradesh Government, whose objective

is to provide clean drinking water by tap to every rural family is changing lives. The Har Ghar Jal Yojana of the Government of India

was implemented on priority by the Yogi government in those districts of the state where the problem of water was a cause of concern for many years. Under Har Ghar Jal Yojana, 55 litres of water is to be supplied to every villager per day. Bundelkhand women have gotten a big relief due to pure drinking water reaching their homes. children's education along

with household chores. They are becoming self-reliant by setting up their employment. There was a time when there were thousands of such villages in Mahoba, Lalitpur, Hamirpur, Jalaun, Chitrakoot, Banda, and Jhansi of Bundelkhand where people did not marry their daughters due to the water crisis. Anurag Srivastava, Principal Secretary, Uttar Pradesh Government, believes that the Jal Jeevan Mission is not only ensuring the supply of clean drinking water from taps in rural areas but is also providing employment to promising and needy people. In such a situation, 13 youths are being given training for this in a gram panchayat. For their skill development, 1,16,366 youth are being given training in plumbing, 1,16,366 electricians, 1,16,366 motor mechanics, 1,16,366 fitters, 1,74,549 masons, 1,16,366 pump operators across UP. In the direction of making rural women selfreliant, along with making rural women self-reliant in UP, 5 women from every village are being given training in water testing (water test kit) for clean drinking water. In

such a situation, women are testing water in the village with field test kits. And making the local administration aware.

In such a situation, till now more than 4,87,955 women have been given training in water testing. And in every village, women are doing 11 types of tests for the purity of water. Due to this, the quality of water from taps, wells, hand pumps and tube wells is also being test-

MALEGAON BOMB BLAST CASE

Sir — Recently, BJP MP and one of the primary accused in the case, Pragya Singh Thakur, along with five other coaccused, appeared before a special National Investigation Agency (NIA) court in Mumbai. They were summoned to record their statements under section 313 of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC). This development follows the prosecution's announcement on September 14 that the process of recording evidence in the case had been completed, and there was no further need to examine prosecution witnesses in this 15year-old terror strike case.

The case, which involved a bomb blast near a mosque in Malegaon on September 29, 2008, resulted in nine fatalities and over 100 injuries, sparking panic in the minority-dominated town in Maharashtra's Nashik district. The investigation has seen involvement from multiple law enforcement agencies over the years, with the NIA taking over in 2011.

Punjab is reeling under socio-economic distress



Without sustainable economic growth, local employment generation, and selfreliance, Punjab's well-being will continue to be a challenge



It's worrisome that Punjab only receives 45 paise for every rupee it contributes to the Centre's tax kitty. This is especially concerning when comparing it to states like UP and Bihar, which receive Rs 1.80 and Rs 1.20, respectively. This revenue-sharing disparity is a significant contributor to the socio-economic distress experienced by Punjab. As a landlocked border state, it's even more crucial for Punjab to overcome this fiscal distress since India's and Pakistan's bilateral trade also halted through the Wagah-Attari route majorly affected Punjab's economy only. The said cost-effective cross-border route can directly short-connect to Europe, a big potential to catalyse the Punjab economy as strong as the economy of Southern-Western States, because of near to seaports.

Being far away from the seaports is one of the major disadvantages that Punjab is struggling with, and has a crippling impact on industrial growth. Secondly, adjoining the sensitive Pakistan border not only halted the trade but Pakistan led to illegal arms supply and drug terror scuffed the social adric and law and order of Punjab Keeping these two major geographical disadvantages centre stage till any central government has not compensated Punjab as it faces odd challenges in comparison to other states. Not even a fair share of tax kitty given, the Rural Development Fund(RDF) and Mandi Fee of Rs 5337 crore have not been released for long. Thus, how long does a fiscally distressed state government alone take forward the most development and welfare-oriented expenditure?

When a state's economy weakens, its people and progress suffer together. This is evident in the current crisis in India-Canada relations, as Punjab's economic distress has led to a migration of its human resources to Canada. Unfortunately, this migration has created a breeding ground for radicals and anti-Indian khalistan extremist activities on Canadian soil, a globalised challenge that has gone unaddressed. The Canadian connection to khalistani is longstanding. Since the mid-80s, there has been a significant exodus of Punjabi youth to Canada, where they often

Views expressed are personal) do odd jobs to sustain themselves. Unfortunately, some of these young people become prey to anti-India extremists.

It is not good to allow a lop-sided economic development of a sensitive state like Punjab. It has its serious repercussions. If we fail to ensure holistic development, then we will be accused of inefficiencies in handling human resources. Unemployment is a multi-faceted problem exacerbating the distressed places associated with poorer mental health, crime and drug abuse. There is enough evidence of drug abuse and distress in the law-andorder situation, that an issue of brimming, can be ascribed directly to unemployment. Punjab, which used to be a

prosperous and progressive state even during its toughest time, is currently facing a significant problem of uncontrolled unemployment due to distressed farming and an imbalanced industrial base. This has rate dropping to 6%, which is lower than the national growth rate of 7.24% in 2022-23. Punjab is currentresulted in Punjad's GDP growth ly ranked at the 19th position, whereas it ranked first in GDP among the states in 1981 and fourth in 2001. Interestingly, UP and Bihar, which were once part of the economically sick states known as 'BIMARÚ' (Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Uttar Pradesh), are now fast-growing economies. UP achieved an impressive growth rate of 16.8%, with a GDP of Rs 20.48 lakh crore in 2022-23, while Bihar's growth rate was 10.98% with a GDP of Rs 7,45,310 crore.

It is crucial to acknowledge that Punjab has immense potential that should not be overlooked when compared to the Southern and Western states. Presently, Punjab's contribution to the country's tax kitty stands at approximately 3%, and it only receives 1.8% of

the divisible pool of taxes allocated by the Fifteenth Finance Commission. In contrast, the Western and Southern states contribute 67% to the central exchequer but only receive a meagre 3-4%. While their argument may appear valid, it is essential to consider that the Southern and Western states account for 53% of India's total factories and have the advantage of being closer to seaports, which can drive economic growth and result in more contributions to the central exchequer. Punjab's sluggish growth may dampen overall economic sentiments, but it still holds enormous potential for growth and contribution to the country's

Undoubtedly, Punjab has the potential to contribute 10-15% as possesses a strong capable and committed entrepreneurial spirit to overcome this economic distress. This spirit has been evident in the past when it overcame the challenges of the partition of india in 1947 and 13 years of militancy in the mid-80s to mid-90s. Within a few years of these events, Punjab was able to rehabilitate its economy and become the richest state in India in the 80s. Today, Punjab seeks a fair interface without any political interference to compete on a level playing field and strengthen its economy, ultimately reducing unemployment.

It is important to consider Punjab's significant contribution to national food security. However, the large areas and population figures of Uttar Pradesh and Bihar provide them with additional leverage from the central tax pool. It is concerning that Punjab only received 1.8% of the Rs 8,16,649 crore distributed by the centre to the states during 2022-23. In contrast, Uttar Pradesh received the highest share at 18% (Rs 1,46,525 crore) and Bihar

at 10%. This highlights why Punjab and other states argue that they are not receiving a fair share of funds, despite contributing more to the

exchequer. During the fiscal year 2022-23, Punjab contributed a sum of Rs 32,800 crore to the central taxes fund, which included CGST, income tax, corporation tax, wealth tax, union excise duty, customs, and service tax. However, in return, the state only received Rs 14,756 crore. This has led to Punjab raising the issue with the Fifteen Finance Commission, as it believes it deserves a fair share of central tax. Despite its efforts, Punjab has been unable to secure an amendment to the Finance Act.

Constitutionally, the purpose of the finance commission is to create some kind of 'equalization' among advantaged and disadvantaged states. From the point of view of equalization, the adoption of population figures as one of the criteria of devolution needs to be jus tified. Therefore, the constitution provides for a fair share of union revenue to be devolved to the states to address this issue.

The Way Forward:

In a federal structure, the central government needs to prioritise the improvement of economic conditions and livelihood prospects for the people of Punjab, which are facing unique challenges in comparison to other states.

It is crucial to take a comprehensive approach that ensures employment opportunities and social respect regardless of demo-graphic and political differences. Without sustainable economic growth, local employment generation, and self-reliance, Punjab's well-being will continue to be a challenge, which is indispensable for the overall well-being of our

Anita Devi, a 40-year-old resident of Hussainpur village, located about 65 kilometres from the Muzaffarpur district in Bihar, lost her husband two years ago. Left with no means to support her family of seven, including four daughters and two sons, she started goat farming to earn a livelihood. She faced criticism when she began rearing goats as a woman farmer. However, Anita resisted because her motivation to provide for her family kept her going. She had started with just two goats. Today, she has eight adult goats and 20 young ones. Goat rearing enabled her to protect her family and improve her financial

Alongside manual labour, agriculture-based employment like cattle, poultry, ducks, and goat farming is a crucial source of income, especially for economically disadvantaged individuals like landless, small-scale farmers, agricultural labourers, and socially oppressed individuals. According to the latest 2019 Livestock census, India has a population of 150 million goats, the second largest in the world. In around half a million remote villages, 70 million farmers are involved In the goat farming business. The primary income from Goat farming comes from milk, which has a production of about 42000 Kgs and meat production, which stands at

Like Anita Devi, Goat farming is an excellent means of self-employment for many rural women. Around rural areas in Muzaffarpur, many women earn their livelihoods through goat farming, becoming breadwinners for their families. 35-year-old Champa Devi, resident of the same village as Aninta, also supports her three daughters and two sons by raising In other instances, older

women in the village claim that their sons and daughters-in-law have stopped providing for them in their old age. These women have, therefore, started rearing 2goats to earn a living. These women leave for the



return in the evening. Goat farming is a hard job, especially during the monsoons. It can be a challenge to find adequate fodder for the goats. The farmers rely on bananas, bamboo, and Banyan leaves to keep

after that, we see an increasing number of women who raise goats in the village. It has become a source of livelihood for many families.

Various non-governmental and government organisations run programs to strengthen the village economy through agriculture-based employment like cattle, poultry, ducks, and goat farming. The Bihar government provides subsidies up to 60% for promoting goat farming. Under the Integrated Goat and Sheep Scheme, there is a provision for subsidising ten goats plus one buck, and 40 goats and two bucks. The government also provides financial aid to

disadvantaged communities the cattle alive. People invest Scheduled fields in the morning to their capital into it. Even Caste/Schedule Tribe and Champa to take loans with

Other Backward Classes. These continuously disadvantaged groups get up to 60% subsidy, while the rest get 50%.

In addition, the capital investment required for raising 20 goats with one buck is about two lakhs, and farmers can take a loan from the bank for this purpose. This process of approving loans goes through the Department of Animal Husbandry in consultation with the bank. After that, subsidies get deposited into the beneficiaries' bank accounts in two instalments. However, because of a lack of awareness, many rural families do not know these schemes, leading women farmers like Anita and

the government should provide adequate training and information to landless, marginal farmers, and labourers about the goat farming schemes. Only then women in vulnerable situations will be able to continue goat farming as a career and give themselves and their families



Wedding hall fire in Iraq kills 100, hurts 150

Araging fire seemingly caused by fireworks set off ding consumed a hall packed with guests in northern Iraq, killing around 100 people and injuring 150 others as authorities warned Wednesday the death toll could still rise.

Authorities said that flammable building materials also contributed to the latest disaster to hit Iraq's dwindling Christian minority. In the fire's chaotic aftermath, officials offered conflicting death tolls and security officials said they had detained staff at the wedding hall as part of their inves-

The fire happened in the Hamdaniya area of Iraq's Nineveh province, authorities said. That's a predominantly Christian area just outside of the city of Mosul, some 335 kilometres (205 miles) northwest of Baghdad. There was no official word on the cause of



the blaze, but the Kurdish television news channel Rudaw aired footage showing pyrotechnics shooting flames up from the floor of the event and setting a chandelier

Multiple witnesses, including 50-year-old wedding attendee Faten Youssef, said the fire started as the bride and groom began their slow dance.

The flames raced through plastic decorations and the ceiling started collapsing, she said. "Flames started falling on Youssef told The Associated Press. "Things were

way to the exit." She said her family found their way out through a kitchen, after the family struggled through smoke and flames and her son failed to kick through a jammed exit door.

It wasn't immediately clear if the bride and groom were among those hurt.

Survivors arrived at local hospitals in bandages, receiving oxygen, as their families milled through hallways and outside as workers organized more oxygen cylinders. Some of those burned included children. Ambulance sirens wailed for hours after the fire as paramedics brought out the injured.

Extravagant wedding ceremonies are common in Iraq, like many countries in the Middle East. Families often invite hundreds of relatives and members of the broader community, spending heavily on spectacular ceremonies with elaborately decorated often including pyrotechnics.

Casualty figures fluctuat ed in the hours after the inci-

An initial Health Ministry statement, carried by the staterun Iraqi News Agency, said the blaze killed over 100 people and injured 150. Health officials in Nineveh province put the death toll at 114, while Īragi Interior Minister Abdul Amir al-Shammari later put the death toll at 93.

A Health Ministry official, speaking to the AP at midday Wednesday on condition of anonymity as he did not have authorization to talk to journalists, said that 30 bodies have been identified by their relatives, but the rest are so badly burned that will require DNA identification.

He put the death toll at 94, with around 100 people still receiving medical treatment. The death toll is expected to

'US soldier Travis, who crossed into N Korea, is in American custody'

he American soldier who L crossed into North Korea two months ago is in American custody, two US officials said Wednesday. One official said that Pvt Travis King was transferred to US custody in China. The officials spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss King's status ahead of the US announcement.

Earlier, North Korea said it would expel King. That announcement surprised some observers who had expected the North to drag out his detention in the hopes of squeezing concessions from Washington at a time of high tensions between

The North's official Korean Central News Agency reported that authorities have finished their questioning of King but did not say when officials plan to expel him or where.

King, who had served in South Korea, sprinted into North Korea while on a civilian tour of a border village on July 18, becoming the first American confirmed to be detained in the North in nearly five years.

At the time he crossed the border, King was supposed to be heading to Fort Bliss, Texas, following his release from prison in South Korea on an assault conviction.

On Wednesday, the state news agency said that King confessed to illegally entering the North because he harbored "ill feeling against inhuman maltreatment and racial discrimination" within the US Army and was "disillusioned about the unequal US society." It has attributed similar comments to King before, and verifying their authenticity is impossible.

'The relevant organ of the DPRK decided to expel Travis King, a soldier of the US Army who illegally intruded into the territory of the DPRK," the state news agency said, using the initials of North Korea's formal name, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. US officials have said that King has been declared AWOL, which can be punished by time in the brig, forfeiture of pay or dishonourable



away and whether the service member was apprehended or returned on their own. Following weeks of silence, North Korea confirmed in August that it had detained King, 23, and was investigating the circumstances surrounding his border crossing.

In an interview last month with The Associated Press, King's mother, Claudine Gates, said her son had "so many reasons" to want to come home. "I just can't see him ever

wanting to just stay in Korea when he has family in America. He has so many reasons to come home," she said.

King, who is from Wisconsin, was among about 28,000 US troops stationed in South Korea as deterrence against potential aggression from North Korea. US officials had expressed concern about King's well-being, citing the North's harsh treatment of some American detainees in the past. Unauthorised crossings across the Demilitarized Zone separating the Koreas are extremely rare. The few Americans who crossed into North Korea in the past include soldiers, missionaries, human rights advocates or those simply curious about one of the world's most cloistered

North Korea's decision to release King after 71 days appears relatively quick by the country's standards, especially considering the tensions between Washington and Pyongyang over the North's growing nuclear weapons and missile program and the United States' expanding military exercises with South Korea.

Leader of Spain's conservatives loses first bid to become PM

 $T^{\text{he leader of Spain's conservatives failed Wednesday in his long-shot first bid to become}$ the country's next prime minister when he fell short of the votes he needed in the Spanish parliament to form a government. As expected, Popular Party leader Alberto Núñez Feijóo came up four votes shy of the necessary absolute majority of 176 votes in his favour. Feijóo will try again on Friday when the bar is lowered and he needs only more "yes" than "no" votes from parliament's 350 lawmakers.

The Popular Party holds 137 seats in the Madrid-based Congress of the Deputies, the most of any party. But even with backing from the far-right Vox's 33 lawmakers and two from small conservative parties representing Navarra and the Canary Islands, Feijóo only reached 172 votes in his favour to 178 against

Spain's July 23 national election left the parliament highly fragmented with its legislators spread between 11 different parties, setting the stage for a difficult path to power for any party. cult path to power for any party. If Feijóo fails to win approval on his second attempt, acting Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez would get a shot at staying in the Socialist leader would have to round up enough support of lawmakers from a group of competing leftist, regionalist and separatist parties from Catalonia and the Basque Country. The parliament debated Feijóo's bid to become prime minister for several hours on Tuesday and on Wednesday morning before the vote. The debate, however, was dominated by the possibility that Sánchez is considering accepting demands from Catalan separatist parties that Spain grant an amnesty for hundreds, possibly thousands, of people who participated in a failed 2017 secession bid by northeast Catalonia. Sánchez, who has pardoned several high-level Catalan separatists, has kept quiet on the possibility of an amnesty, and only said that he wants to continue "normalising" relations with the northeast region where tensions have decreased in recent years.

6 climate activists take on European nations

Six young people argued that governments across Europe aren't doing enough to protect people from climate change at the European Court of Human Rights on Wednesday in the latest and largest instance of activists taking governments to court to force climate action.

Legal teams for the 32 nations — which includes the 27 EU member countries, the United Kingdom, Switzerland, Norway, Russia and Turkey questioned the admissibility of the case as well as the claim that the plaintiffs are victims of climate change harm.

But lawyers representing the young adults and children from Portugal said the nations they're suing have failed to adequately address human-caused warming and therefore violated some of the group's fundamental rights.

Barrister Sudhanshu Swaroop, a counsel for United Kingdom, said national governments understand the threat of climate change and its challenges and are determined to tackle it through international cooperation

He said the plaintiffs should have gone through national courts first, and stressed that since they are not nationals of the countries they are attacking, other than Portugal, the European Court of Human Rights cannot have jurisdiction.

"There was no attempt by the applicants to invoke, let alone exhaust domestic remeagreed Isabelle Niedlispacher, a legal expert for Belgium.

Pleading on behalf of the oung people, Alison Macdonald told the judges about the urgency to tackle the biggest crisis that Europe and the world" have perhaps faced, and that they should play a bigger role in helping control planet-warming emissions. "It cannot be within a state's discretion whether or not to act to prevent catastrophic climate destruction," she said.

US allows Israeli citizens to travel to America visa-free

 $T^{\text{he Biden administration is}}_{\text{admitting Israel into a}}$ select group of countries whose citizens are allowed to travel to the United States without getting a visa in advance.

The decision announced Wednesday comes despite Washington's concerns about the Israeli government's treatment of Palestinian Americans and marks a major accomplishment for Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who has sparred frequently with the Biden administration.

Under the waiver programme, Israelis will be able to travel to the US for business or leisure purposes for up to 90 days without a visa simply by registering with the Electronic System for Travel Authorisation. But even if they are authorised to travel under that system, US officials at the airport can still bar them from entering the country. Israel had been facing a Saturday deadline, the end of the US government's budget year, to gain admission to the programme without having to requalify for eligibility next

The Department of Homeland Security administers the programme, which currently allows citizens of 40 mostly European and Asian countries to travel to the US for three months without visas.

Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas said the agreement, after more than a decade of work, "will enhance our two nations' collaboration on counterterrorism, law enforcement and our other common priorities" and make the allies

more secure. Secretary of State Antony Blinken, in a joint statement with Majorkas, cited enhanced "freedom of movement for US citizens, including those living in the Palestinian Territories or travelling to and from them". Israel's admission has been a priority for successive Israeli leaders. It comes as mass protests against his proposed remake of Israel's judicial system that critics say will make the country less democratic. Countries that want to

take part in the visa programme have to meet three critical benchmarks.

Israel met two of those benchmarks over the past two years: a low percentage of Israelis who applied for visas and were rejected and a low percentage of Israelis who have overstayed their visas. Israel had struggled to meet the third, for reciprocity that essentially means all US citizens, including Palestinian Americans, must be treated equally when travelling to or through Israel.

Claiming national security reasons, Israel has long had separate entry requirements and screening processes for Palestinian Americans.

Azerbaijan rejected the accusation, arguing the region could receive supplies through the Azerbaijani city of Aghdam a solution long resisted by Nagorno-Karabakh authorities, who called it a strategy for Azerbaijan to gain control of the region.

Some 42,500 people, or about 35 per cent of Nagorno-Karabakh's ethnic Armenian population, had left for neighoouring Armenia as of Wednesday morning, according to Armenian authorities. Hours-long traffic jams were reported on Tuesday on the Karabakh to Armenia.

UK authorities first drug consumption room

Ccottish authorities on Wednesday approved a 2.3 million-pound (\$2.8 million) pound drug consumption room, the first governmentbacked place in the UK where users can take illegal drugs such as cocaine and heroin under the supervision of medical staff.

Local officials in the Scottish city of Glasgow on Wednesday approved the facility, which had long been delayed by political disagreements.

Authorities hope the pilot project will help tackle drug misuse problems in Scotland, which has the highest drug death figures in Western Europe and saw almost three times the rate of drug poisoning deaths compared to the UK average in 2021.

The facility, which will start recruiting staff next year, was first proposed in 2016 following an HIV outbreak in Glasgow among people who injected drugs in

It's backed by the Scottish government, although some lawmakers have raised concerns about the impact on local residents and business-

Proponents, including Scotland's drug and alcohol policy minister Elena Whitham, say evidence from more than 100 similar facilities worldwide, including in and Germany Netherlands, show they work to save lives and reduce over-

all costs to health services. The centre will be staffed by trained health care professionals and offer a hygienic environment where people can consume drugs they obtained elsewhere.

Officials say people can't share drugs with others in the facility, and that health and social workers at the centre will offer advice and support on recovery and welfare.

UN asked to declare 'gender apartheid' as Af womens' mental health worsens

The UN's most powerful body must support governments seeking to legally declare the intensifying crackdown by Afghanistan's Taliban rulers on women and girls "gender apartheid", the head of the UN agency promoting gender equality said Tuesday.

Sima Bahous, executive director of UN Women, told the Security Council that more than 50 increasingly dire Taliban edicts are being enforced with more severity, including by male family members. That is exacerbating mental health issues and suicidal thoughts especially among young women and is shrinking women's decision-making even in their own homes.

"They tell us that they are prisoners living in darkness, confined to their homes with-



Under international law,

apartheid is defined as a system of legalized racial segregation that originated in South Africa. But a growing consensus among international experts, officials and activists says apartheid can also apply to gender in cases like that of and girls face systematic discrimination. "We ask you to lend your

full support to an intergovernmental process to explicitly codify gender apartheid in international law," Bahous urged the 15-member council, including its five permanent

members: the United States, Russia, China, Britain and There is no existing inter-

national law to respond to "mass, state-sponsored gender oppression," Bahous said. But she said the Taliban's "systemic and planned assault on women's rights...must be named, defined and proscribed in our global norms so that we can respond appropriately".

The Taliban took power in August 2021 during the final weeks of the US and NATO pullout forces' from Afghanistan after 20 years of war. As they did during their previous rule of Afghanistan from 1996 to 2001, the Taliban gradually reimposed their harsh interpretation of Islamic law, or Sharia, barring girls from school beyond the sixth grade and women from almost

all jobs, public spaces, gyms

The Security Council meeting on UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres' latest report on Afghanistan took place on the final day of the annual meeting of world leaders at the 193-member UN General Assembly.

On Wednesday, Zabihullah Mujahid, the main spokesman for the Taliban government, slammed the council meeting for focusing on domestic Afghan matters of "women's education and their work" instead of issues such as secu-

rity, peace and stability.
"It was necessary to discuss the end of the blacklist in the United Nations, the removal of sanctions, the release of seized assets," Mujahid said on X, formerly known as Twitter. He said the UN gathering should also have discussed "the recog-

nition of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan" as the Taliban call their government. No country has recognized

the Taliban, and the assembly's

credentials committee hasn't either, primarily over its effort to relegate women to their homes and failure to form an inclusive government. This has left UN recognition with the now-ousted previous govern-ment led by Ashraf Ghani. For the third year, its representative did not speak at the high-level gathering. Bahous said that over the

past year, UN Women collaborated with the UN political mission in Afghanistan known as UNAMA and the UN International Office for Migration to interview over 500 Afghan women.

Among their key findings, she said: 46% think the Taliban should not be recognised under

any circumstances; 50% think the Taliban should only be recognised after it restores women's and girls' rights to education, employment, and participation in government. The women inter-

viewed said the dramatic shrinking of their influence on decision-making, not just at the national or provincial level but also in their communities and homes, is driven by increased poverty, decreasing financial contribution and "the Taliban's imposition of hyper-patriarchal gender norms," Bahous said. In a grim sign of women's

growing isolation, she said, only 22% of the women interviewed reported meeting with women outside their immediate family at least once a week and a majority reported worsened relations with other members of their family and com-

Kakar admits military influence to continue in Pakistan polity

 $U_{\text{role of the army in}}^{\text{nderscoring the inevitable}}$ Pakistan, caretaker Prime Minister Anwaarul Haq Kakar has admitted that the country's military will continue its hold in politics unless civic delivery institutions are strengthened in the coup-prone country. The powerful Army, which has ruled coup-prone Pakistan for more than half of its 75-plus years of existence, has hitherto wielded considerable power in matters of security and foreign policy.

Kakar was speaking during an interview with the news channel TRT World, a Turkish public broadcaster, on Tuesday, when he spoke about the Pakistani military's major role

"Pragmatically, realistically and honestly ... affirmative, yes," was his answer when the interviewer asked if the disciplined military would continue to stay for a foreseeable future in Pakistan's polity.

Kakar was replying to a question about the "undue influence, whether suspected or real, of the military establish-

ment of Pakistan" and its role. He was asked: Can Pakistan work as a democracy when most Pakistanis believe

the almost nefarious relationship with the military?

"As far as the civil-military relationship and its imbalance is concerned, I personally view it as a pure government structure. Pakistani politicians, all the political leadership, have had a marital alliance with this military institution for their own specific interests," the caretaker prime minister said.

"And once they are out of power, it is one of their favourite mantras to criticise and shift the onus of their own failures in terms of governance and pinpoint the reason behind that failure as an imbalance between the civil and military relationship," he pointed out.

"Unfortunately, in our case, the civilian institutions who (sic) are responsible for the service delivery at the behest of the government or state, are performing quite poorly in last three-to-four decades be it in our health services, be it in our education services, be it our disaster management, be it our tax revenue collection," he said, adding, "So, when there is poor governance challenge, the only institution which has the organizational capability left with us is military?

"So anyone who is leading the government has to rely on

the day-to-day basis on the challenges of government and engage them to do that delivery part," the leader from the Balochistan region said.

He also offered a remedial measure: "If somebody is genuinely interested that the military should not meddle in the affairs of the state structure, then we need to enhance the capability of these civilian institutions." The question about the military's influence had earlier stemmed from another question about the alleged US involvement in former prime minister Imran Khan's ouster.

Kakar promptly dismissed it as a "conspiracy theory" that is common in all kinds of political cultures. Khan was ousted from power in April 2022 after losing a no-confidence vote, which he had then

conspiracy targeting him because of his independent foreign policy decisions on Russia, China, and Afghanistan.

Khan is also facing more than 140 cases across the country and faces charges like terrorism, violence, blasphemy, corruption, and murder.

Observing that they (Khan's party) themselves had retreated and they retrieved that allegation themselves in a couple of months, Kakar said, "How would I, or anyone else, believe in such a conspiracy when people who brought it to public domain backtracked from it (sic)." Kakar said his government,

even if a caretaker dispensation, has ensured that "no one, whether it is the USA or any other power, meddles in our domestic affairs." "We are a sovereign country, we are a sovereign nation. We do things according to our own interests. Whether that was a good decision or a bad decision to oust Imran Khan's government, but all we know is for the last many, many, many years, that was the only way and time that he was ousted constitutionally. There was no military coup. That was all constitutional and lawful,"

9 killed in blast as kids play with rocket shell in Pak's Sindh

Karachi (PTI): At least nine

people, including five children, of the same family were killed on Wednesday when a rocket launcher's shell exploded at a house when the kids were playing with the ammunition in Pakistan's Sindh province, police said. Kashmore-Kandhkot Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Rohil Khosa said children found a rocket shell while playing on the ground and brought it home where it exploded, killing nine people, including five children, two women, and two men, of the same family. Iran launches imaging satellite into orbit amid tensions with the West

Iran claimed on Wednesday that it successfully launched an imaging satellite into space, a move that could further ratchet up tensions with Western nations that fear its space technology could be used to develop nuclear weapons.

Iran's Communication Minister Isa Zarepour said the Noor-3 satellite had been put in an orbit 450 kilometres (280 miles) above the Earth's surface, the state-run IRNA news agency reported.

It was not clear when exactly the launch took place. There was no immediate acknowledgment from Western officials of the launch or of the satellite being put into orbit.

The US military did not immediately respond to a request for comment. Iran has had a series of failed launches

"The publication of the preliminary constituencies will continue for 30 days from Sept 27 to Oct 26," it said, highlighting that objections to the preliminary constituencies can be made by the voters of the concerned constituency. The through representations would be in the form of representations addressed to the commission's secretary and be submitted to the ECP Secretariat in Islamabad by October 27.

'The EĊP will take decisions on these representations from Oct 28 to Nov 26 after hearing the positions of the

respective parties," the release said. The final list of constituencies would be published on November 30, followed by issuance of the elections sched-

The completion of the delimitation brings ECP closer to holding polls by the last week of January, as planned by the body. A specific date for the elections is yet to be announced. The ECP earlier stated 54 days were required to let the candidate file nominations, their scrutiny and final approval as well as time for election campaign. That is why it said that the elections would be held in the last week of January. The initial listing of electoral districts is the first major step to fulfill the commitment to hold polls by the end of January.

NASA astronaut and two ARussian cosmonauts returned to Earth on Wednesday after being stuck in space for just over a year. American Frank Rubio set a record for the longest US spaceflight — a result of the extended stav.

The trio landed in a remote area of Kazakhstan, descending in a Soyuz capsule that was rushed up as a replacement after their original ride was hit by space junk and lost all its coolant while docked to the International Space Station.

What should have been a 180-day mission turned into a 371-day stay. Rubio spent more than two weeks longer in space than Mark Vande Hei, who held NASA's previous endurance record for a single

spaceflight. Russia holds the world record of 437 days, set in the mid-1990s.

The Soyuz capsule that brought Rubio and cosmonauts Sergey Prokopyev and Dmitri Petelin back was a replacement launched in February. Russian engineers suspect a piece of space junk pierced the radiator of their original capsule late last year, midway through what should have been a six-month mission. Engineers worried that without cooling, the capsule's electronics and any occupants could overheat to dangerous levels, so

the craft returned empty. There wasn't another Soyuz to launch a fresh crew until this month. Their replacements finally arrived nearly two weeks "No one deserves to go home to their families more than you," the space station's

Andreas Mogensen, said earlier this week. Prokopyev told ground controllers throughout the descent that all three were feeling good. They experienced more than four times the force of gravity as their capsule

Implementation of NFSA, LPG subsidy to be evaluated


Niti Aayog is looking to hire a technical consultant to evaluate the implementation of the National Food Security Act (NFSA) and LPG subsidy to ensure benefits are reaching eligible beneficiaries.

The government think tank's Development Monitoring and Evaluation Office (DMEO) has floated a tender to select a technical consultant for "Central Coordinating Agency for Evaluation of the National Food Security Act and LPG Subsidy".

"The government imple-ments one the largest public food and nutritional safety nets in the world through the National Food Security Act (NFSA), enacted in 2013.

"...However, despite the large public expenditure, gains in the food security and nutritional outcomes in India have been slow, with the country accounting for roughly 30 per cent of the global burden of hunger," DMEO said in the RFP (request for proposal) document.

The National Food Security Act provides a legal mandate for the distribution of foodgrains at subsidised prices, cooked meals, take-home rations, and food security allowance through a network of schemes — namely the Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS), Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS), and Mid-Day-Meal (MDM) scheme.



cost of implementing MDM and ICDS was Rs 12,900 crore and Rs 17,252.21 crore (Revised Estimate), respectively. According to the DMEO

report, "More than 1/3rd of children less than 5 years are stunted (35.5 per cent, NFHS-V, 2019-20), one-quarter of adolescents aged 10-14 years have low body-mass-index (BMI) for their age (24 per cent, CNNS, 2016-18), and more than half of all women aged 15-59 years and 15-19 years are anaemic (57 per cent and 59.1 per cent, NFHS-V, 2019-20)".

Elaborating on the rationale behind the evaluation of the LPG subsidy, DMEO further said that India is the third largest energy consumer in the world after China and the US.

'The current consumption of LPG in India has risen to 12.3 per cent of total petroleum products compared to 1.13 per cent of kerosene. The ongoing

ative," it added.

DMEO also said the demand for oil and gas has been burgeoning over the years with rising population, economic growth, and concomitant

demand for cleaner energy. To meet future energy demands, a market-determined price mechanism (MDPM) was introduced through price dereg-ulation, which allowed the refineries to stipulate refinery gate prices of petroleum products that would compete with prices of imported products, it

DMEO pointed out that the LPG subsidy not only reflects the policy makers' cognizance of the need to augment the transition from traditional cooking fuel, such as firewood and dung cake to cleaner cooking fuels but also to provide them to a majority of the underserved population — mostly from rural areas and economically weaker sections — at subsidised rates.

Adani Ports to buy back another \$195 mn of bonds

dani Ports and Special Adam rons and I USD 195 million of debt due in 2024 as the conglomerate helmed by Gautam Adani looks to boost investors' confidence post being targeted by a US short-seller.

In a stock exchange filing, APSEZ said it will buy back USD 195 million of bonds due in 2024 using its cash reserves. Out of the USD 520 million principal outstanding, USD 325 million will be left after the buyback, it said.

The company board "has approved tranche II of the tender offer to purchase for cash up to USD 195 million in aggregate principal amount of the outstanding 3.375 per cent senior notes due 2024 which represents 30 per cent of the principal amount of the notes," it said.

In May, the company had bought back its July 2024 bonds for cash USD 130 million in regate of the amount and stated that it would buy back 20 per cent of the principal amount of the bonds in each of the next four quarters.

In the second tranche of this, the company is now proposing to purchase up to USD 195 million of bonds. This represents 30 per cent of the principal amount of the bonds (USD 650 million). After USD 130 million buyback in May, USD 520 million remained outstanding.

The buyback tender is open till October 26, the filing said.

Adani Group has been attempting to rebuild investors' confidence since Hindenburg Research in a January 24 report accused it of accounting fraud and improper use of offshore tax havens for stock manipulation.

The group has denied all allegations. The company has engaged Barclays Bank, DBS Bank, Emirates NBD Bank PJSC, First Abu Dhabi Bank PISC, Mizuho Securities (Singapore) Pte Ltd, MUFG Securities Asia Singapore Branch, SMBC Nikko Securities (Hong Kong) and Standard managers for the offer. The company will pay accrued interest, in respect of any notes purchased in the tender offer.


